Township clips tax rate for '81 fiscal year

Establishment of 1981 millage rates Tuesday night squashed the hopes of some Canton board trustees to pump more money into the police department next year.

The township's Board of Trustees approved township administration-proposed millage rates for police, fire and the general fund which, in effect, rolls back the total township rate by .61 mill (61 cents per \$1,000 assessed property valuation).

Despite the rollback, property owners actually will pay higher tax bills this December because of a 23 percent hike in property assessments. According to Finance Director Mike Gorman, the owner of a home assessed at \$25,000 will pay \$281 more.

Assessments, the basis of property tax computations, must approximate 50 percent of market value according to law. The county and state annually take steps to adjust assessments.

THE RATES approved Tuesday night include 3.25 mills for police, 3.25 mills for fire protection and a net 2.39 mills for the general fund.

The general operating levy reflects an effort to juggle funds and improve accounting procedures as well as the .61-mill rollback.

Last year, property owners paid 3.25 mills for police, 1.25 mill for fire protection and five mills for the general fund. However, the equivalent of two

mills (\$653,000) was transferred from the general fund to the fire department.

This year, the fire department totally will operate on its own millage and self-generated revenues, such as ambulance runs.

The .61-mill rollback in the general operating tax includes an effort to comply with Headlee Amendment requirements by cutting taxes .11 mill.

Gorman said township administra-

tors proposed the Headlee rollback, despite no legal requirements to take that step. Headlee requires government to roll back the millage rate whenever property assessment increases exceed the inflation rate.

According to Gorman, the millage cut of .61 mill exceeds the Headlee requirement to roll back taxes by a net half mill.

THE TAX RATES were hotly debated at Tuesday's board meeting. After a

one-hour discussion, trustees approved the rates proposed by the administration by a narrow 4-3 vote.

Two of the dissenters — Trustees Robert Greenstein and Steve Larson — pushed for a higher cut as well as a move to provide more funding for police. Their proposals would hike the police levy by a quarter to one-half mill and slice more than that amount from the general fund levy.

Storm pay-back hopes rise with label of disaster

A federal disaster designation means Canton could recover up to 75 percent of the cleanup costs set off by a fierce July windstorm.

"We can pretty well rest assured that the municipalities will get back 75 percent," said Rick Sitz, a legislative aide to U.S. Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor.

"I really hope we can see assistance into the (communities) within the month."

Sitz's comments came earlier this week, after he arrived in the area to assist local communities on filing for federal disaster relief because of that storm. The Federal Emergency Management Agency Monday announced that federal disaster assistance funds will be made available to 10 Michigan counties, including Wayne.

Ford's 15th Congressional District — which includes Canton — was particularly hard-hit by the storm. Canton suffered more than \$5 million in damages.

"Congressman Ford made it very clear that storm debris — toppled trees, smashed fences and other damage, was creating a potential hazard from fire or rats," said Sitz.

The federal emergency agency earlier had recommended denial of Gov. William Milliken's request for federal disaster designation on the grounds there was no immediate "peril to life and safety," said Sitz.

Sitz said meetings will be set up with local officials to explain federal eligibility guidelines and applications pro-

cedures. He said he was unsure if regular pay for cleanup workers would be included.

"I STRESS eligible," said Sitz. "So far, it's all overtime — outside contractors. For the most part, most of the costs will be reimbursable."

Canton grants coordinator Terry Carroll said he doesn't have a dollar figure on the cleanup cost. He said there was some damage to township property, including the recreation center, Griffin Park and golf course.

"We have to figure out the cost of cleanup versus overtime," said Carroll. "Some (claims) may go to the insurance company."

IN THE meantime, other forms of assistance already are in progress.

For example, Milliken earlier had declared the storm-hit areas state disasters. That designation carries a cap of \$20,000 per community.

State funds weren't disbursed because the Legislature was on summer recess.

Help also is available for homeowners, business persons and farmers.

The federal Small Business Administration offers low-interest loans for qualified applicants. Deadline for filing is Oct. 14 for homeowners and May 13, 1981 for business persons.

Missionary work called Canton teen to India

Last year, Maurice Stebila's school buddies thought he was crazy to give up a summer of tennis to go to Africa to put roofs on church buildings.

This past week, those same friends were full of questions about Maurice's recent trip to India to help erect a college dormitory.

The Canton Township youth, an 11th grade student at Plymouth Salem High, has just returned from his second summer on a work crew with a non-denominational missionary group based in Merritt Island, Fla.

Each year, Teen Missions International attracts some 2,000 youths for missionary trips to about 30 countries. The workers, who range from 14 to their early 20s, have adult supervisors.

Maurice, who attends Good Shepherd Reformed Church in Westland, endured snakes, steamy weather

Drainage complaints spur revival of township efforts to mediate spats

A pool of muddy water can take its toll on neighborhood relationships.

One homeowner points an accusing finger at the resident next door and attributes his own drainage problems to the neighbor's build-up of topsoil. The neighbor levels the same accusation at someone down the street or blames the township for approving an incorrect lot grade.

Employees of Canton's planning and building departments have heard dozens of complaints like those.

In August 1979, the township made an effort to help by instituting a policy to mediate the neighborhood quarrels.

But planner Jim Kosteva admits that the policy never really had a chance to become effective. Winter came. Then a crunch in building department revenues forced the lay-off of the township's only grade inspector.

The policy centered on a township inspection of the complainant's property in an effort to determine a solution to

the problem and even the party at fault.

RECENTLY, Canton Township trustees took steps to pump life into the old policy.

Under their action, the township will pay the consultant firm of Wade, Trim & Associates to make technical inspections. According to Kosteva, the cost is \$75 per lot.

About 25 homeowners are waiting for the inspections, which Kosteva expects will begin later this month. They are among the estimated 40 lot owners who filed written complaints under the policy implemented more than a year ago.

Kosteva said the lots of only two homeowners were inspected last fall. His assistant, Dave Nicholson, said many of the problems were resolved during the preliminary stages of the investigation.

"The intent (of the policy) is to re-

solve the problems as peacefully as possible," said Nicholson. "It could become a potential problem between people who have to live next to each other for 10 or 20 years."

However, use of the policy could land one or more homeowners in court.

The policy provides for prosecution of homeowners who refuse to right a situation that impedes the drainage of a neighboring lot.

Homeowners would be charged with changing the township's approved plat. Conviction in 35th District Court would be a misdemeanor with a maximum penalty of 90 days in jail and a \$500 fine.

NICHOLSON SAID no one has been prosecuted under the policy so far.

Kosteva added that most inspections will fail to show a blatant violation that could lead to court. In those cases, the township will suggest a solution to the homeowners involved, such as the re-

moval of a layer of topsoil.

"Unless it's really blatant, it's hard to point a finger," Kosteva said. "Who do you point a finger at — the grading inspector, the engineer, the landscaper who added the extra topsoil?"

"At least we'll be giving people a solution to their problems."

Some lot owners have blamed the township for the poor drainage on their lots. They accuse the building department of approving incorrect grades at the time their house were completed.

Kosteva said individual cases would be brought before the township board if the inspection shows the township at fault.

Not all cases will go to the technical inspection stage, however. Problems may be identified during earlier phases of the investigation.

Homeowners with a drainage problem may request a township investigation by filing a written complaint with

Marijuana blooms

Police crack down on illegal growers



This marijuana plant often is mistaken for a common weed.

It's harvest time in Canton. For most people, harvest means tomatoes and sweet corn. For others, September days may signal a peak ripening time for the marijuana plant.

"We're getting two or three complaints a week," said Police Lt. Larry Stewart. "Somebody calls and says John Doe is growing marijuana alongside his house or on a window sill or next to his mobile home."

"That (complaint rate) compares to about one a week in June," added Stewart. "After the first frost, there's none."

A township ordinance forbids growing marijuana, as does a state law. The misdemeanor infraction carries a maximum penalty of \$500 or 90 days in jail, or both.

Stewart said some 25-30 persons have been issued tickets under the

ordinance during the past year. "We would be much more interested in the guy that has gone down 15 times before rather than somebody who's growing a plant on a lark," said Stewart.

"I'M RELATIVELY sure there are some small plots around," he added. "I would like to find an acre or two. That would make my day."

Stewart said marijuana is an annual plant which belongs to species *Canabis Sativa L.* The plant, which is asexual, has a male and female variety.

The flowering top of the female is blended into a tobacco-like mixture to produce euphoria or a "high," added Stewart, who attended a state police training program on marijuana detection.

"Until it starts growing its flo-

wers, the female (plant) isn't a very good high," said Stewart. "The male isn't very strong at all."

According to Stewart, the Michigan variety usually grows to a height of about six feet, though some grow taller. Hashish — a more powerful substance — comes from a resinous compound in the plant, he said.

"(MARIJUANA) is commonly mistaken for a weed called cinqufoil," said Stewart. "It's a pretty green — a rich color."

Processing of the cases includes observation of the plant's growth, as well as a chemical and organic test which takes place at the police station.

Clippings of the plant are taken to the station where they may be cultivated and harvested.

"We have had a number of small (plants) harvested ourselves," said Stewart. "It has an odd number of leaflets (with) long, narrow, serrated edges. Hair growth is substantially different."

"Marijuana has three types of hairs on the leaf," he added.

What happens to the marijuana after the case goes to trial?

You won't find the marijuana "evidence" sold off at any police auction. Instead, the marijuana is taken to an incinerator plant in Inkster.

Stewart recalls a case a few years ago when he was with the Garden City Police Department. Almost 400 pounds of marijuana was taken to that same incinerator.

"They (the plant workers) couldn't believe we would burn up so much marijuana," said Stewart.

The band members selected their own colors and style of uniform.

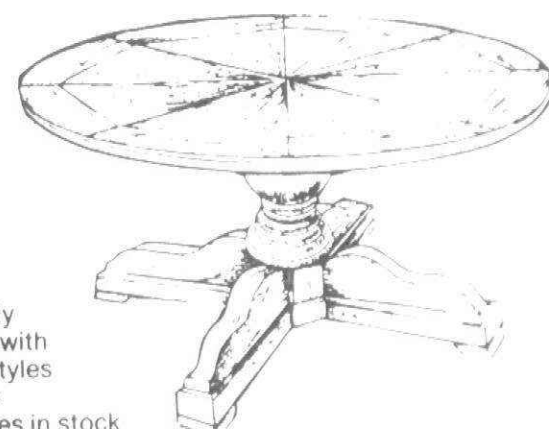
The funds to pay for the new uniforms were raised by the band members and by the Band Booster Club.

Area volunteers declare war on disease

Carol Smith of Canton soon will be hearing bells. So will Sharon Belobraidich of Plymouth and many more folks from the Plymouth-Canton community. Doorbells, that is. Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Belobraidich are just two of the volunteers who have signed on for a door-to-door awareness and fund-raising campaign for the American Diabetes Association. During the first two weeks of November, they will be distributing educational leaflets and asking for donations.

"We need volunteers," says Annette Lippmann, public relations director for the Michigan affiliate of the American Diabetes Association. "We're starting early enough."

Between Nov. 16-22, free diabetes testing will be conducted at St. Mary Hospital in Livonia, Wayne County General Hospital in Westland and Plymouth General Hospital in Detroit. The association is awaiting approval from other area hospitals, including Garden City Osteopathic, St. Joseph Mercy in Ann Arbor, and Veterans' Administration hospitals in Allen Park and Ann Arbor.

"WE'RE HOPING for a cure for diabetes," says Mrs. Smith of Ranier Boulevard in Canton. She has volunteered to help because her 13-year-old daughter is a diabetic.

"We're concerned about the long-range complications (of the disease)," she adds. "The future is in the research."

Diabetes is a disease in which the body is either unable to produce sufficient insulin, or is unable to use the insulin that is produced, according to the American Diabetes Association. Insulin is needed to convert starches and sugars into energy.

STATISTICS SHOW that about 6 percent of the population has diabetes, and 40 percent of those are undiagnosed. There currently is no cure, and the disease is controlled by diet, medication and weight control.

Long-range complications include blindness, kidney disease, gangrene, heart diseases and stroke.

The combined fund-raising and educational program is a pilot project and may later be expanded throughout the state, adds Ms. Lippmann. The Plymouth-Canton community was selected largely because of previously successful efforts spearheaded by Mrs. Belobraidich and her husband Frank, a diabetic, says Ms. Lippmann.

"THOSE COMMUNITIES seem well-organized," she adds. "We teach diabetes survival."

For Mrs. Smith, "survival" means preparing prescribed portions of meals well-balanced for her daughter, 13, who was diagnosed a diabetic three years ago.

It also means keeping the girl in a positive frame of mind and making sure she takes her daily injection of insulin and exercises regularly.

Mrs. Smith says her daughter "accepts" being a diabetic, but prefers to avoid calling attention to it.

The girl declined to be interviewed. There are two other daughters in the family, aged 17 and 18.

"Those shots (of insulin) are hard to take every day (but) people have to understand it isn't the end of your life," notes Mrs. Smith. "I think that comes from how the family accepts it."

MRS. SMITH believes it is difficult for children to accept restrictions of diabetes, commenting that her daughter has befriended a classmate who also has the disease.

"I really think being with other kids who have the same problem helps," adds Mrs. Smith.

The Michigan chapter of the American Diabetes Association operates Camp Midicha, which gives diabetic children a chance to develop friendships while promoting good health.

In the past several years, Frank and Sharon Belobraidich have planned bike and skating marathons which have raised thousands of dollars for the diabetes association. They have planned periodic educational programs for area diabetics and their families.

THE COUPLE, who live on Ann in Plymouth, are on the board of directors for the Michigan affiliate of the American Diabetes Association.

Frank, 42, was diagnosed a diabetic nine years ago. As an employee of the state of Michigan, he often has had to commute long distances for his work.

Sharon is a first-grade teacher at Bird Elementary in Plymouth. The couple have two daughters, aged 17 and 18.

"I don't know if it's harder for the diabetic or his family," says Mrs. Belobraidich. "You go to a very rigid schedule (of meals and injections). It's definitely an adjustment."

MRS. BELOBRAIDICH says things are fine when her husband maintains the diet and gets his exercise. But changes in diet, stress and other factors can cause irritability and illness.

"Maybe he wouldn't like it for me to say, but it's true," she adds. "He is eating some things he shouldn't and he isn't exercising."

"Maybe you rebel after a while," she adds.

Mrs. Belobraidich says some of the local fund-raising and educational programs are hampered by a lack of volunteers. She has found that most volunteers are spouses or mothers of diabetics.

"I get calls all the time from people who want information about recipes and other things," adds Mrs. Belobraidich. "I think it's worthwhile."

Persons who want to volunteer for the door-to-door campaign may call Mrs. Belobraidich after 4 p.m. at 453-5009.

Group gives help to diabetics

Could you be a diabetic and not know it?

The American Diabetes Association (ADA) reports that 6 percent of the population is diabetic — and 40 percent of those cases are undiagnosed.

Diabetes is a disease in which the body is either unable to produce sufficient insulin, or isn't able to use the insulin that is produced. Insulin is needed to convert starches and sugars that are eaten into energy.

Complications of the disease include blindness, heart disease and stroke, kidney disease and gangrene. There is no cure, but diabetes can be controlled with injections of insulin or oral medication.

In some cases, diabetes can be controlled without medication. Also essential is a diet which balances intake of fats, proteins and carbohydrates. Regular exercise is important.

Who is likely to develop diabetes? ADA statistics show that persons who

are overweight or who have diabetic relatives are more prone to the disease.

It also is more likely to strike persons over 35 and women.

INSULIN-DEPENDENT diabetes, most frequent in children and young adults, is characterized by the sudden appearance of constant urination, abnormal thirst, unusual hunger, rapid weight loss, irritability, weakness and fatigue or nausea and vomiting.

In addition, area hospitals will be

working in cooperation with the diabetes association to give free blood tests to detect the disease (see separate story this page).

ANNETTE LIPPMANN, public relations director for the ADA, explains that persons are required to eat a high-calorie meal about two hours before the blood test.

If the blood sugar level is abnormal, the person is referred to his or her physician.

Board adopts tax rates

Treasurer Jim Donahue, who also dissented in the millage vote, favored a slight cut in the fire and general fund tax proposal and a slight increase in the police tax.

Their views supported a request by Police Chief Jerry Cox to hike funding of the police department in 1981. Three weeks ago, Cox asked the board to set the police rate at four mills, an amount that would allow for the hiring of 10 patrol officers. Cox said repeating last year's tax rate of 3.25 mills would keep police services at its current level, at best.

Greenstein and Larson favored setting the police tax at 3.5 to 3.75 mills. They favored cutting the general fund levy by at least a quarter mill as a way to compensate taxpayers for rising assessments and dismal economic conditions.

Their proposal would necessitate a minimum \$109,000 cut in the general fund budget proposal

submitted by Supervisor Noel Culbert, according to Gorman.

"If the citizens can cut back, so can we," said Greenstein. "I'm suggesting it's better to commit more millage to police and fire where it can't be frittered away. The more money we have to fool with (in the general fund), the more we perpetually waste."

Greenstein maintained that the board has "shortchanged" the police department during the past few years. Supervisor Noel Culbert, who participated in the drafting of the tax proposals, defended the rates which were later approved.

"I think Canton is in a very fortunate position in not having to lay off police officers," he said. "I also think we are showing responsibility to the taxpayers. We could choose not to lower taxes at all."

Under the township charter, board members must approve budgets based on the millage rates by Oct. 31. The fiscal year begins Jan. 1.

Burglar digs fast-food restaurant

Is it possible the burglar had an uncontrollable craving for a midnight snack?

Canton police are investigating the break-in early Tuesday of a Burger Chef restaurant on Ford Road near I-275. Lt. Larry Stewart said a person or persons cut a hole through a sheet metal roof and climbed through.

An employee reporting for work discovered the break-in about 6 a.m. Tuesday, said Stewart. The business had been closed up around midnight.

No money was missing, although a building safe had been moved, said Stewart.

"They didn't get anything," he added. "We can only hypothesize that they ran out of time or got scared. They didn't go through a vent like they usually do (on roof break-ins)."

Stewart speculated that the would-be thief might have been further disappointed because "usually there isn't that kind of money (in the restaurant) at night."

"Fast-food chains arrange for pick up," he added.

Attorney spurs loan plan for small businesses

Canton attorney Mitch Howard believes small businesses in the area need help.

He is taking steps to spur the expansion of smaller, local businesses through the formation of a Local Development Corp. (LDC), an agency to help entrepreneurs get low-interest loans.

Howard is writing articles of incorporation for the agency to include both Canton Township and the city of Plymouth. He says business problems extend

beyond political boundaries.

"I happen to like Canton," said Howard, who shares a law office with township Trustee Robert Greenstein on Ford Road. "I think its growth potential is exciting. I represent several small businesses and I appreciate their problems."

He believes an LDC would offer some of the help small businesses need. He got the idea, he said, after talking to an employee of the Small Business Administration (SBA) about a client's

need for a loan.

ACTING AS A MIDDLEMAN, the LDC, said Howard, would enable businesses to obtain low-interest loans from the federal SBA — lately at 8½ percent interest — for purposes of expansion or relocation to the area.

A businessperson would submit an application to the LDC for a low-interest loan. After reviewing the application, the LDC would forward the loan request to the SBA. According to How-

ard, approval is based on the number of jobs the expansion project would provide.

Howard said the LDC would charge a small handling fee to the business for obtaining the loan in its own name.

"The purpose, essentially, is to help develop the community, expand the tax base and to provide jobs," said Howard, a newly appointed member of Canton's Economic Development Corp. (EDC).

"It cuts red tape — I'd say in half."

The township's EDC primarily works

with larger industrial concerns, helping them to obtain low-interest loans.

THE CANTON TOWNSHIP Board of Trustees recently gave Howard its support in the form of a resolution endorsing establishment of the corporation.

Frank McMurray, president of the Canton Chamber of Commerce, said he has heard numerous complaints from businesspersons concerning problems in obtaining loans.

McMurray said the "SBA is like a

monster out there." He said the chamber "supports anything that can be done to help small business people."

For now, Howard is writing articles of incorporation for the agency and searching for members for the new group. To be recognized by the SBA, an LDC needs at least 25 members. Howard said 75 percent of the membership must live in the LDC service area.

Members elect a board of directors, who would screen individual loan applications.

and dysentery in India. For his efforts, he has a clutch of Indian art objects and lots of good feelings.

"IT REALLY felt like a second family," said Maurice, 15. "I grew up. We all helped each other and taught each other. I'm young and I'm glad I'm doing this now."

Maurice said the teens may opt to be members of "evangelistic," or spiritually-oriented teams, or work groups. He prefers the work crews.

Last year's trip to Nigeria, where he helped put roofs on three churches and built septic tanks, whetted Maurice's

appetite for more. He signed up again.

A girl who attends Good Shepherd with an evangelistic group to Scotland. An adult member served as a group leader in France, said Maurice.

The trip to India cost \$2,000. To help pay for the trip, Maurice found 32 people who were willing to put up \$60 each to sponsor him. He attended work training sessions and a form of boot camp which "really built you up — physically, mentally and spiritually."

AFTER A 24-hour plane ride, India was a "culture shock," said Maurice. He saw many more animals in India than he had the previous year in Africa,

including cobras, elephants, water buffaloes, monkeys and oxen.

They also saw much poverty, and both adult and youth beggars. The teens experienced dysentery and cramps.

Maurice lost weight and suffered from heat rash in the tropical climate where they were building the dormitory, about 500 miles from the capital of New Delhi.

The group slept on floors, visited local markets and temples during the construction period. On Sundays, they would visit local people.

"WE WERE warmly received," said

Maurice. "They were kind and generous. They gave a lot and didn't ask for anything in return."

Now that he's back at home, with parents Frank and Irene, and sisters Nicole and Monique, the trip to India "seems like a dream," said Maurice.

Helping keep the memory alive are artifacts which include a hand-carved table, delicate objects inlaid with ivory and silver, and pictures.

"It was really weird coming back," said Maurice. "Those loving, wonderful teens — I would never be with them again in the same way."

"He seems to appreciate everything more now," said Mrs. Stebila.

- An informal inspection of the lot by building and planning department officials.
- A letter sent by the township to the homeowners involved. Suggested solutions may be offered. The township may cite a specific garden or structure as the cause of the problem.
- A technical inspection by Wade, Trim & Associates if the problem still is unresolved.

- The writing of a report by the planning department, building department and Wade, Trim.
- A second letter sent by the township to property owners. A specific homeowner may be told to correct a violation of the plat act. Suggested solutions to the drainage problem will be offered.
- The case may be turned over to the ordinance department for prosecution of a homeowner who refuses to comply with the findings.

Cops plan safety classes

The Canton Police Department will sponsor a hunter safety program for 12-16-year-olds on two consecutive Sundays this month.

State law requires the training for all hunters in that age bracket.

Housing law confusion ends

A new state law has been passed which will allow apartment buildings or condominium complexes to be occupied only by senior citizens.

The legislation had been introduced by State Sen. Robert Geake, R-Northville, and recently was signed into law by Gov. Milliken.

At the bill-signing ceremony, Geake praised Milliken's action and commended Rep. Roy Smith, R-Ypsilanti, for his efforts in getting the measure pushed through the House of Representatives.

Also attending the ceremony were Ray Bourlier, Reginald Williams, Wilfred Shultz and William Neff, all members of the Crestwood Park Condominium board of directors in Plymouth.

"It was their organization which

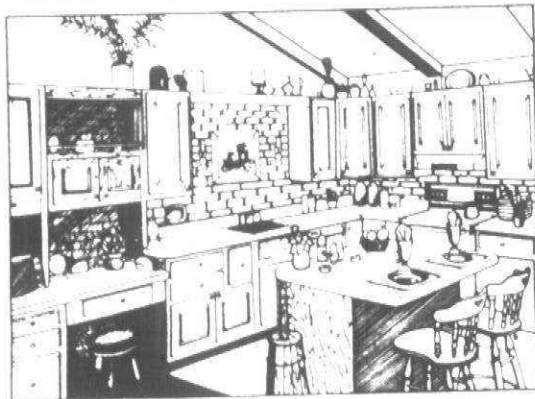
brought the confusion to my attention," said Geake, "when residents in that complex were faced with the problem of one owner in the project attempting to sell his unit to a family with children."

The law clarifies conflicting language in the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act of 1976.

As the act was written, one section prohibited age discrimination in the sale or rental of real property but allowed an exemption for senior citizen housing.

A later section, however, repeated the prohibition regarding age discrimination but made no reference to the preceding exemption for senior citizens. The new law clarifies the intent of the Legislature by including the senior exemption in the later section, said Geake.

Classes begin at Schoolcraft as mediators examine issues

Schoolcraft College students are back to the books, and a state mediator has one month to propose a settlement between 350 back-to-work instructors and the community college.

Wayne County Circuit Judge Michael L. Stacey Tuesday signed an order which returned striking teachers to their jobs and which also sent a primary salary dispute to a so-called "fact-finder."

But Stacey did not issue an injunction as requested by the Schoolcraft Board of Trustees.

Both sides have five days to agree on a mediator, who will act as the fact-finder. If there's no agreement, the Michigan Employment Relations Commission (MERC) will appoint one.

"WE'RE PLEASED with the concept of the back-to-work order," said Delavan W. Sipes, president of the Faculty Forum, the teachers' union. "It gets us back to work, and we still have a mechanism for getting a settlement."

A two-week strike in 1978 also was

ended when a judge ordered the dispute to fact-finding.

Schoolcraft President C. Nelson Grote said Tuesday, "I'm very confident that a settlement will be reached. What the judge has done is in everybody's best interest."

Monday, Judge Stacey ordered both sides to bargain rather than proceeding with a hearing on the college's request for an injunction to force 160 full-time and some 189 part-time instructors back to work.

According to one faculty negotiator, there was no progress at Monday's bargaining session, which was held in the downtown MERC offices. Grote said the two sides were "very close to reaching a contract" Monday but would not elaborate.

"The board hasn't budged one bit," said Richard Arlen, chief faculty negotiator.

But, Arlen added, because an injunction wasn't ordered, "the faculty is feeling pretty decent. Since it's not a binding fact-finder, the board can say no and we can say no."

Both he and Sipes are full-time in-

structors at the two-year college.

STACEY GAVE the fact-finder 30 days to propose a settlement.

The teachers are seeking a two-year contract with raises of between 9 and 10 percent each year for full-time instructors. According to the faculty, the college is sticking with its offer made before the strike began Sept. 2 — 8 percent the first year and 7.25 percent the second.

An estimated 90 percent of Schoolcraft's full-time instructors make the maximum allowed under the expired contract — at least \$24,300 a year.


The majority of the faculty, however, are part-time instructors paid on a "contact hour" basis. They are now paid about \$14 an hour, which Grote has said is "extremely low."

The college said in a statement last week that it has offered part-timers a 14 percent raise effective the upcoming winter semester and 13 percent the following winter semester.

The college has said it cannot provide a larger than 7.25 percent second-year increase for full-time faculty without taking the money from the proposed part-time faculty raises. Faculty negotiators have refused to agree with the proposal.

An Eagle

An Eagle Court of Honor will be held in his behalf on Sept. 18 in the Plymouth Elks Lodge.



Directs campaign

Keith Molin of Ann Arbor has been selected to direct the campaign of U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, in his bid for a third term in Congress. A former director of the Michigan Labor and Commerce departments, Molin also has been a major force in the Michigan Republican Party. He directed the 1970 Milliken campaign and served on the governor's campaign advisory committee in 1974 and 1978 and also directed former Congressman Philip Ruppe's first campaign in 1966. He served in several key positions in the Milliken administration from 1971-79 and now is associate director in the Office of University Development at the University of Michigan.

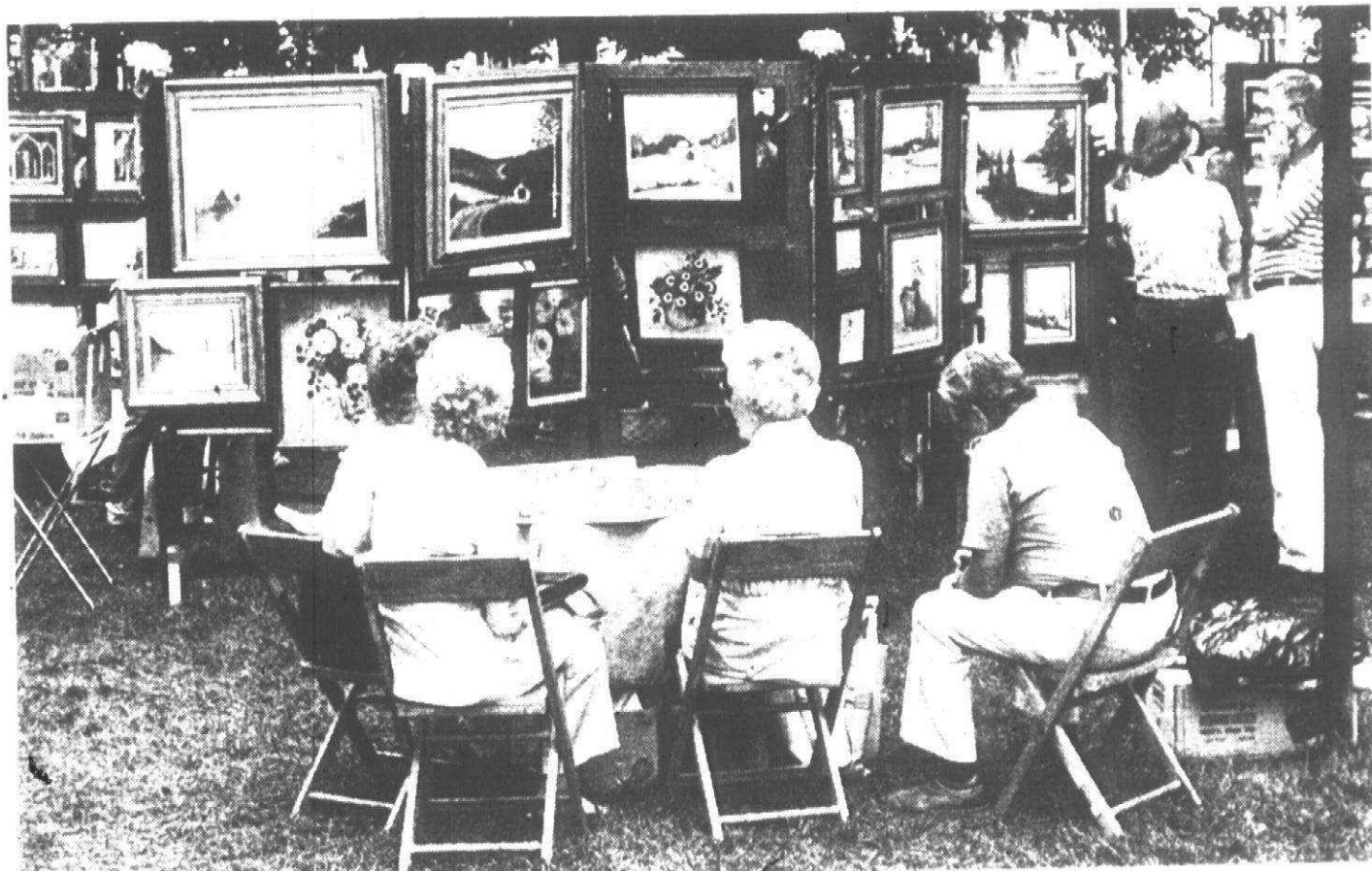

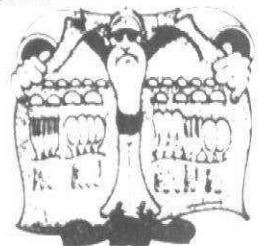

Smith still plays a numbers game

From the time he was a student in the Wayne high school until he reached his present position as president of the Ann Arbor Mortgage Company, now located on Main Street, George Smith's life has been dealing with numbers.

First, he was quarterback on his high school football team and later held down the same position with the Spartans of Michigan State when the late "Biggie" Munn was the coach. At those positions his status as a regular depended for the most part in calling the right numbers in the code of signals.

And now, as the head of the mortgage company, he has dealt with numbers in real estate that have left him in the position where his company is dealing with \$80 million in mortgages.

Sitting at his desk the other afternoon revealing his life of numbers he made no effort to hide his pride in dealing with those mortgages. He pointed with pride to a new machine in the corner of his office across from City Hall that keeps him in touch with the New York money market every minute of the business day.

"the only play a fellow makes in a college football game not only beats us, but ruins my day. I could have gloried in the fact that I once won a big college football game with a field goal. Few fellows, these days, can boast of anything like that."

Aside from playing quarterback on the State football team Smith also participated in track and field as a shot putter.

His best effort was 51 feet. This was a good heave in those days. But the thing that made him chuckle again as he recalled his college days was the fact that he tried out for the boxing team and made it. "And I was a team mate of Chuck Davey, the former boxing commissioner."

When he graduated from Michigan State in 1950, Smith turned to real estate, possibly with the thought that ground sometimes is valuable, as he learned on the football field.

A success from the start, he turned to mortgages in 1965 and now is riding the crest with \$80 million in mortgages. But he still is haunted by the numbers 55 and that 7 to 3, defeat that deprived him of being a gridiron hero.

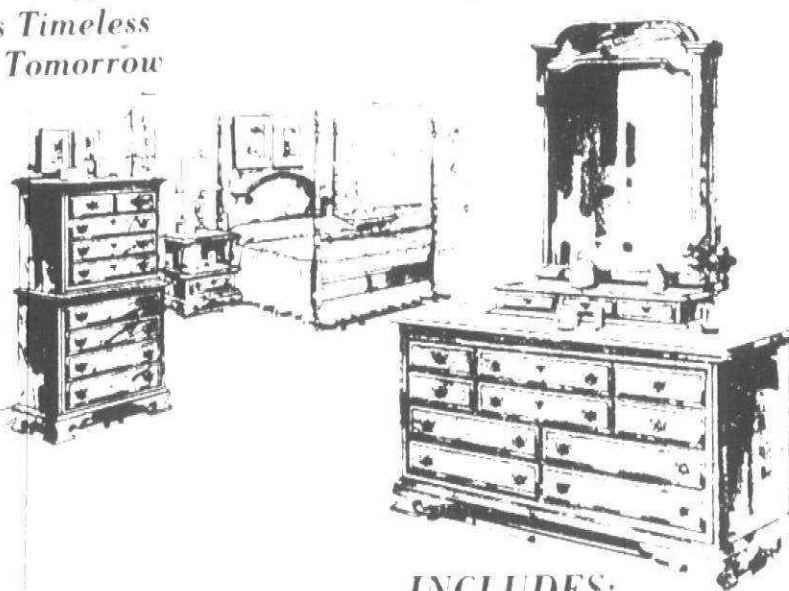

Education chief visits district on Monday

Accompanying Mrs. Hufstедler will be U.S. Rep. William Ford, chairman of the Subcommittee for Post-Secondary Education, and Larry O'Rourke, deputy assistant secretary for public affairs.

Mrs. Hufstедler was interested in visiting a representative working class community in industrial America. The citizens' involvement and the school systems' record of solving problems facing public education were keys to Mrs. Hufstедler's decision to visit Wayne-Westland, according to district officials.

A number of years ago, Wayne-Westland adopted a philosophy of life-long

learning. When Mrs. Hufstедler was appointed by President Carter as secretary of education, she took as her theme, "Learning Never Ends."

Mrs. Hufstедler's schedule on the day-long tour will include Roosevelt/McGrath School in Wayne; Wayne Memorial High School, where she will be served by students in the Blue and Gold Room restaurant; Lincoln Elementary School in Westland; John Glenn High School in Westland; and the Educational Social Service Center complex in Westland.

Before being appointed as secretary of education, Mrs. Hufstедler served as a judge for 11 years on the Ninth Circuit of the U.S. Court of Appeals. She was also an associate justice of the California Court of Appeals and served for five years on the Superior Court of Los Angeles County.

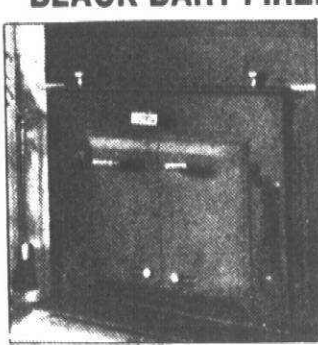

Says business reputation was hurt

A local artist is threatening legal action against the city of Plymouth, the Fall Festival Board, or both, because of an incident at the community's 25th annual Fall Festival last weekend.

Thomas LeGault of Westland, son of Karen LeGault, owner of a flower-gift shop at 884 Penniman Ave., claims he was harassed by local police and that his business reputation was marred when his one-man art show was closed by police Sunday.

"I was so embarrassed," he said of the police action. "There were people gathered all around with purchases in their hands and I had to deny them a sale."

LeGault said he's not sure who he will sue and on what charge but he's shopping around for an attorney to work out those details.

"I have no idea why I was singled out but I just want to find out who has the Gestapo power to close a legal business."

On the first three days of the festival, LeGault had his show of acrylic paintings set up on the lawn of the Jack Wilcox home at 676 Penniman Ave., which faces Kellogg Park.

However, after his first run-in with police officers Saturday, he moved the display to the area neighboring his mother's gift shop. LeGault said he's held his show on the lawn of Wilcox's home for seven years with no problems.

LeGault SAID he moved the show for two reasons, not related to the police request to close out.

"It was because of the big dumpsters that were located near there and because of bees and garbage trucks there. There was also a rumor going around that I was paying Jack \$1,000 to set up on his property, which wasn't true. I didn't want to cause Wilcox any uneasiness."

Lt. Henry Berghoff of the Plymouth Detective Bureau told LeGault to move his merchandise off the Penniman site.

"He was selling paintings on the curb and that's against city ordinance," said Berghoff.

Quoting from that ordinance, Berghoff said that only the Fall Festival Board has the authority to allow a commercial operator to conduct business during the fall festival within the downtown area.

Berghoff added he was acting on order from City Manager Henry Graper, who had received a complaint from festival chairman Carl Glass.

Asked if he or his patrol officers harassed LeGault, he said:

"Absolutely not. I explained the ordinance to him and that was it."

"Carl Glass wouldn't have complained if he had granted LeGault permission to operate."

Berghoff couldn't explain why, after seven festivals, action was now being brought against LeGault.

"We don't allow any commercialism during the Fall Festival," said Glass. "This is the time we set aside for amateurs to get some exposure."

"Amateurs must submit an application to the festival board explaining their project and how they will use their proceeds. There's an entry fee. And LeGault didn't do any of that."

"He just wanted to capitalize on the situation and be there for the crowds the Fall Festival draws and we had upwards of 15,000 a day this year."

Wilcox, meanwhile, said he had always allowed LeGault to display his work on his lawn contingent on authorization from the festival board, which

he assumed LeGault had.

"He was just getting started, seemed like a nice young man with some talent, and I wanted to help him out."

"THE CITY officials have always come down here in the past and admired his work," Wilcox added. "But there was criticism of the commercialism of the Fall Festival last year and I think that's the background for this dispute."

If he does take legal action, LeGault said he'll be seeking the restitution of his family name, which he feels was damaged by the public incident.

"I lost a whole lot of business. That's the time I sign up students for the fall art classes."

"This was no casual incident. There's more people in Plymouth this weekend than any other time. We had radio spots and other advertising put out, stating that we'd be open then."

Civil Air Patrol honors Redington

The squadron again will represent Michigan in the upcoming 1980 Great Lakes Region Competition, to be held at Wright Patterson Air Force Base.

In addition to his success with teens in the cadet program, Redington guides a staff of senior adult members, many of whom were active in the recent disaster relief after the July storm which caused damage throughout the Detroit area.

Redington's personal accomplishments include participation in CAP missions, and in search and rescue missions. He has attained senior ratings in communications and cadet programs.

He also has been awarded leadership, recruiting, red service and unit citation ribbons and has been awarded

the CAP communicator badge.

A former member of the 300th Military Police unit in Livonia, he has been recipient of numerous military decorations, including the U.S. Army Commendation Medal.

His wife Nan also is a CAP member.

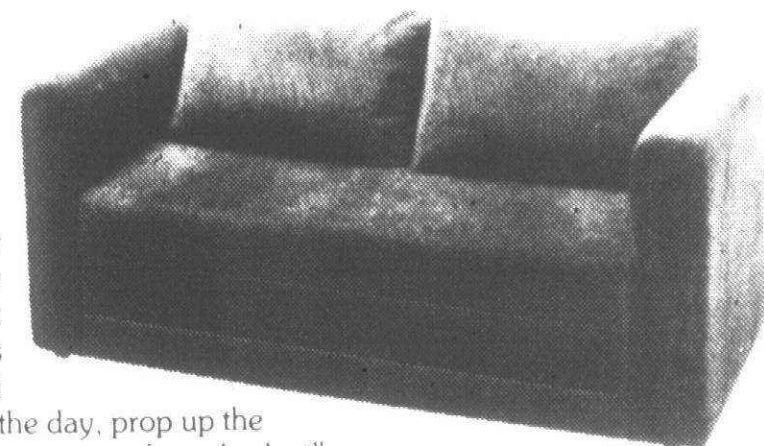

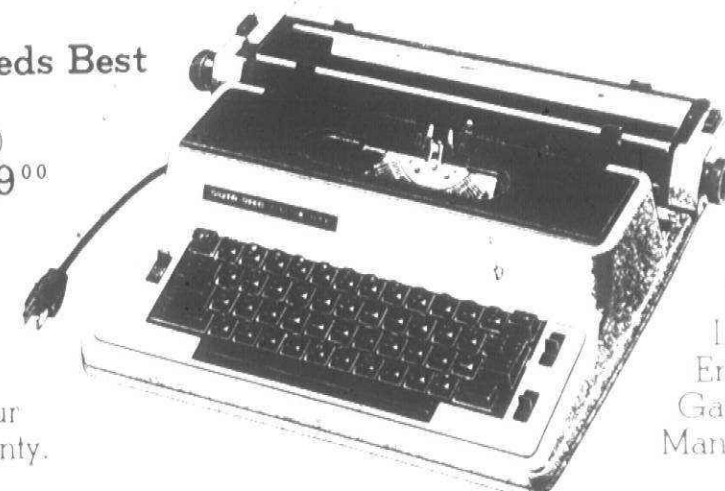

Each winner was presented with a first place ribbon, a gift certificate from local merchants, and for the children an additional prize of two silver dollars.

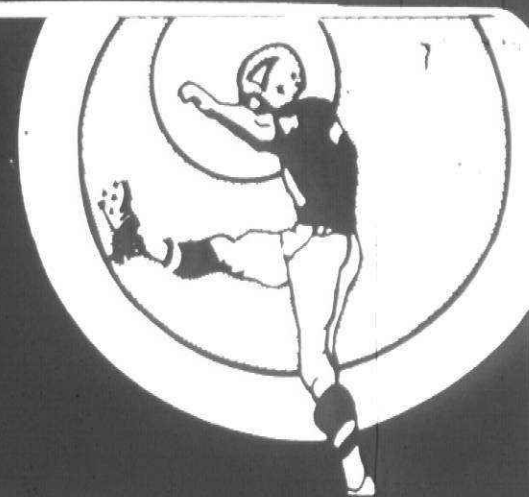
Gift certificates were donated by Plymouth Book World, Gould Cleaners, Lents, the Little Angel's Shop and the Sophisticates.

2nd chance for diploma offered

The Plymouth-Canton Community Education Department is offering full preparation classes and testing services to residents seeking the G.E.D. (General Educational Development) certificate.

The G.E.D. is commonly referred to as the High School Equivalency Test. The six-hour, five-part test covers writing skills, math, literature, science and social studies. Individuals who take the test and meet the standards of the

State of Michigan receive a Certificate of Equivalency. Although this certificate is not identical to a high school diploma, it is accepted by most colleges and employers in the Detroit area.

The preparation classes are designed to familiarize students with the expectations of all five areas of the test and prepare them psychologically for the test itself.

David Dursum, assistant director for community education, urges those planning to take the G.E.D. test to first complete a preparation class.

"More than 90 percent of the students who complete the class will pass the stringent test," he said.

He added that the G.E.D. is not an end for many who pass the test because this success tends to build self-confidence, prompting students to continue taking classes at Plymouth-Canton and Schoolcraft College.

THE 15-WEEK preparation class is free to all students. Courses are offered in the morning, afternoon and evening. High School credit is earned for those interested in working toward a high school diploma.

Lab facilities are provided at the G.E.D. center for those needing additional help and instruction.

Persons interested in registering for the preparation class, or any other activity offered by the district's community education department, can sign up at the Community Education Office at Plymouth-Canton High School, 8415 Canton Center Road, Room 130.

Registration is ongoing from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 6:30 p.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Thursday.

The G.E.D. test is offered to those at least 18-years-old.

Services offered for aged residents

A wide variety of services are available to the elderly in the Plymouth area through the Plymouth Community Council on Aging.

The ongoing services available to senior citizens include the vial of life, information and referral, skill bank and the senior discount program.

The information and referral service is a telephone location which puts seniors in contact with providers offering help with various problems of the elderly.

Such information on services is available by calling 455-4907 between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday. At other times the caller's message will be recorded and they'll be called back.

The vial of life is a program whereby

medical information is placed at a predetermined location in a senior citizen's home available to rescue service by arrangement when they arrive. The vials are available at fire stations in the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

Under the senior discount program certain local merchants allow 10 percent or more discount on purchases. An official ID card is required. Participating merchants will have a decal on their windows. A directory of participating merchants is made available to card holders.

The skill bank is a program where tradesmen and handymen help retirees with small repairs and home maintenance for a reasonable charge negotiated between workman and homeowner. Volunteer workers still are needed.

Nov. 4: It's voting day—not political auction

It appears that Republican supervisor candidate James Poole is trying to buy some votes Nov. 4.

His promise to slash the supervisor's salary by \$7,000 next Dec. 1 adds a new twist to Canton's traditionally turbulent political scene.

Poole, a former trustee who ran unopposed in last August's GOP primary, says Canton's supervisor is paid too much money. Under action taken by the township board last winter, the supervisor's salary will jump from \$29,000 to \$32,000 Dec. 1.

He has asked the Township Board to lower the salary of the incoming supervisor. But state law prohibits governmental bodies from taking salary action during the 60-day period preceding an election, according to a spokesperson for the Michigan Townships Association.

Poole promises to return \$7,000 in the form of a charitable donation if the Township Board refuses to accept his "recommendation." An advocate of a

ballot advisory question on the superintendent (manager) form of government, Poole endorses an additional \$10,000 cut in the supervisor's salary when a manager-type position is filled.

His entire proposal would lower the supervisor's pay from \$32,000 to \$15,000 annually.

POOLE PROBABLY will hoodwink at least some voters with his proposal. After all, he appears willing to perform a job on the basis of dedication — not because of promise of financial return.

But in reality, Poole's idea is a dangerous campaign tactic. It could turn election day into an auctioneer's search for the lowest-bidding candidate.

Elections should not be won or lost on the basis of a candidate's financial need. Only the rich would win positions of political power if voters based their decisions on the type of proposal offered by Poole.

That's not to imply that Poole is a wealthy man.

He works part-time as a real estate agent to supplement his \$15,000 annual pension as a retired Air Force major.

That pension will continue if Poole wins the supervisor's position. Additionally, most of the pension is tax-exempt because of an injury sustained in Guam following the Korean War, according to Poole.

Most township board candidates lack that type of financial cushion. Candidates for full-time administrative jobs typically arrange for leaves of absence from their regular places of employment.

UNLIKE POOLE, they must rely on the salaries of Canton's elective positions to buy food, pay the rent and maintain their lifestyles.

Township board members set the supervisor's salary at the current level for a reason. They wanted to attract qualified candidates for the job. Few

persons with well-paying jobs in the private sector could accept a full-time elective office if it meant a substantial pay cut.

Citizens who feel the supervisor's salary is too high should petition the township board to refrain from approving pay hikes in the coming years. Residents who favor the superintendent (manager) form of government should lobby for an in-depth study of the issue.

But the supervisor's pay should not be bandied about as an election issue.

Voters have two more months to size up Poole against his opponent — incumbent Supervisor Noel Culbert, who, as expected, opposes Poole's pay-slashing idea.

Voters should base their decision on the issues — not on the "cheapest" bid.

Middle class feels state's service cut

It was a perfect day to pick out a campsite. The sun glistened on the sparkling lake. The blue sky was devoid of clouds. A mild breeze cooled the summer air.

But something was amiss in northern Michigan. A long line of cars clogged the usually serene entrance of the state park campground. Campers mumbled, first among themselves and then to the harried attendant at the desk.

He smiled grimly, trying to maintain his composure.

Labor Day campers, used to congestion, were irate. One of the two camping areas around the lake had been closed.

THERE WASN'T any explanation, just a sign: "Closed. Use park on south side of lake."

They wanted to know why, on the busiest weekend of the summer, one campground was closed.

Nonchalantly, the park employee told them: "Twelve people were just laid off. We don't have enough people to maintain both parks."

Very quickly, Michigan taxpayers are facing the realities of the much-lauded tax rebellion.

Gov. William Milliken has taken to the trend, slashing the budget left and right — \$900 million worth in the last two years. Natural Resources, the parent agency overseeing the parks system, is being cut by 27.4 percent.

OTHER STATE AGENCIES are finding their budgets being cut with equal vigor as the recession reduces revenues. Labor will be cut by 36.8 percent, Transportation 25.3, and Commerce, 24.3. The litany continues in descending order.

And although Milliken is, for the most part, using his best judgment in making cuts, state taxpayers should finally be able to see the folly of storming the tax ramparts when supporting more drastic tax cut proposals as put forth by Shiawassee County Drain Commissioner Robert Tisch.

We should all breathe a sigh of relief and pray hard that higher courts will back up the recent court decision to ban Tisch from the ballot.

For however long implemented, the Tisch proposal would cripple state government beyond belief by draining its resources to help local governments. Among those who would be the most hard hit would be the persons who pay the most taxes in this state — the middle and working class.

Ironically, that is where Tisch receives the majority of his support.

If Tisch, or any like amendment in the future, is foisted on state taxpayers, much more than the closing of a state park would be at stake.

Look at it this way: If the state is forced to make Tisch-type cuts, it won't be the prisons that will be closed down. But your kid's college tuition, already too high, could go right through the roof.

IN MANY CASES, poor students will make their way through on scholarships. Mom and dad, of course, still will be able to foot the bill for the rich kid on the block.

But the middle class kid is going to be left out in the tax cut rain. There just won't be the money to go around.

Hopefully, the modest Milliken cuts have awakened the public to the reality that state government, competently managed, is needed and that incompetent measures as proposed by Tisch should be flushed down the drain — forever.



Toast to a home town stream — the blue St. Clair

Sitting on the banks of the St. Clair River one afternoon enjoying the start of a summer vacation, The Stroller kept humming the words of an old song:

"Mid pleasures and palaces, wherever you may roam,
Be it ever so humble, there is no place like home."

It wasn't because the St. Clair River is a humble stream. But of all the rivers he has encountered during his stroll along life's trail, he never has cast his eyes on one that was so different and so dear to him.

As he sat there at Marine City, looking a mile into Canada, visions of other rivers came to The Stroller's mind.

DURING HIS TENURE as a sports writer, he was called upon to visit all sections of the country and cross many rivers.

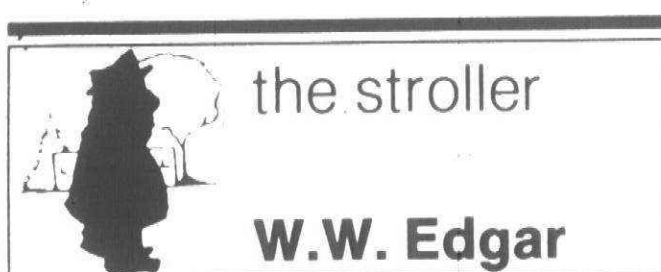
Traveling with his little portable typewriter, he viewed the Hudson River from the plains of West Point, N.Y. And he was on the banks of the Hudson at Poughkeepsie for the big college rowing regatta.

Yet none could equal the sight he saw that afternoon as he looked across the blue water that is part of the St. Lawrence Seaway.

The Stroller has crossed the muddiest of America's streams — the Mississippi, the Ohio and the Missouri. There is nothing beautiful about any of them, though they hold a high place in America's commerce.

On his trail of the college rowing regattas, The Stroller has had the good fortune to watch the Harvard crew on the Charles River in Boston, the Housatonic at New Haven, Conn., where the Yale crew gained its reputation, and at Syracuse, where the Cornell oarsmen held forth.

Few are so beautiful. Few provide a place where you can look into another country. Few carry so



much commerce. Few give you a close-up of giant lakes freighters carrying their cargo from Duluth to the manufacturing plants of the Midwest and ocean freighters, too.

None of those rivers can equal the blue St. Clair for all-around glamour.

IN THE SPACE of two hours, The Stroller caught sight of freighters from seven nations. They proudly flew their flags from the stern, and it became a game as to how many ocean-going freighters could be seen in the space of a few hours.

These things make the St. Clair different from all other rivers he has seen. This includes even the world-famous Thames, flowing through London, where The Stroller viewed the stream from the entrance to Westminster Abbey. It also includes the Rhine in Germany and the dirty Seine in Paris.

Sure, some of them had glamour. But not one had all the things that make of the St. Clair the one river that stands out above the rest.

True, too, there are no castles high on the banks of the St. Clair like one sees along the Rhine. But none of these famed rivers produces anything to equal the St. Clair River pickerel.

Properly prepared, the pickerel is a dish to set before a king, and no other river on the face of the globe can boast so appetizing a dish.

So, here's to the St. Clair River — may its blue waters never change.

State history needs touch of the comic

History books aren't bunk, but they do launder the truth quite a bit for the tender-minded. The history of Indians, the last half of Tom Jefferson's love life, the question of what disease really killed Beethoven all illustrate that tendency.

I ruminated on the sanitizing of history as we drift-fished last week at Drummond Island, off the eastern tip of the Upper Peninsula.

Our hostess, Karen Kemppainen, had given us a short printed history of the northern Lake Huron island. I mention her because folks around here knew her as Karen White, Southfield High class of '65 and later a resident of Farmington Hills.

AFTER THE WAR of 1812, the British had to move out of their Mackinac Island fort, now such a tourist attraction, and sought another location.

The Southwest Fur Company wanted the new location to be what is now Drummond Island because it was on the fur trading route to the upper lakes. So there the British located a fort.

The final treaty, however, placed Drummond inside the United States, the pamphlet said. "From 1815-1828, His Majesty's redcoats paraded on the natural limestone parade grounds, and the British Union Jack flew over Drummond Island — even though it was part of the United States and since 1826 a part of the newly formed Chippewa County. Finally they were obliged to leave."

Those are the basic, sterile facts, according to the local pamphlet. "Finally they were obliged to leave."

But you wonder:

What did the red-faced redcoats say to the fur company management after they were forced to give up a fort?

How did the Americans ever manipulate the international boundary line east of Drummond when the deep-water shipping channel is west of Drummond?

What kind of language was used when an American traveler tried to land on this American island with a British fort?

Whom did the British Colonial Office sack when it found another fort was lost?

Such colorful details are absent in the history books.

IT WOULD TAKE a comedian like Bob Newhart, in one of his telephone monologues, to do the situation justice.

"Hi, Col. Collyer? Gov. Lew Cass in Michigan Territory calling. Belle's fine, thanks. Say — the fur trade is great? You say fort is impregnable? And you're thinking of mining the limestone? Well, ah, Colonel, that's what I wanted to talk to you about. Afraid I have a little bad news. Bad news for you."

My reverie ended when my companion's fishing pole quivered and then bowed as he hooked a fat yellow perch. We would have plenty of perch and beer for our bellies that night.

But our curiosity about the human details of history would be unsatisfied.

In a photo workshop, you practice immediately

Many of you at some time have taken a photography course, either through a local college, community adult education programs or even the neighborhood camera store. These courses are fine, and you can learn many important aspects of photography.

There is, however, another kind of learning situation which combines a classroom setting with on-location shooting. These learning combinations are called photography workshops. They may be as short as a local afternoon outing or as long as a month's journey to one of the world's exotic locations.

Watch for announcements of nature walks at Huron-Clinton Metroparks, where you can learn a lot of nature as well as practice photography.

The main advantage of a workshop is the combination of classroom and shooting situations. You are able to apply what you have learned in a classroom immediately. You need not wait for the weekend to arrive with hopes the weather will be suitable and you won't forget what you've just learned.

able and you won't forget what you've just learned.

IN SHORT, workshops take you to where pictures are made. There is nothing quite as invigorating as receiving a new piece of information from a workshop instructor and then immediately putting it into practice.

This educational process strongly reinforces what you just learned. You won't forget it.

There is also tremendous camaraderie among workshop participants. Never will you be in a learning situation where the love of photography is as contagious. The interactions between workshop students -- informal discussions, seeing how others do it, sensing how others feel, sharing photographic ideas -- are truly a learning stimulant.

I myself studied with Ansel Adams in a workshop in Yosemite National Park. Between the setting and the instruction, it was the closest thing to being in heaven.

Workshop instructors take personal interest in their students, and many one-on-one sessions are available. Setting up a shot with the help of fellow students and instructors offers the best opportunity to optimize in such areas as composition and depth of field. Your photographic perception will be stimulated, your vision enhanced.

WORKSHOPS OFFER the chance to travel and learn -- to see new and exciting places quite often at only a slightly higher expenditure than if you traveled there on your own.

The typical late-night bull sessions can be rewarding, too.

Learning to photograph well is like learning tennis well. For example, you can talk to pros for hours on end and read every tennis book in print. But only when you pick up your racket and get out on the court will you really start learning the game.

Similarly in photography, you must pick up your camera and get onto the "court." You must begin to shoot pictures in order to feel and learn what photography is all about.

Workshops offer an excellent opportunity to do just this. Combining learning with shooting is the fastest and most positive way to enrich your knowledge and in 1980, Monte Nagler, with local photographers Terry Luke and Don Loosi, Monte Nagler will conduct a PhotoVenture workshop Sept. 26-28 in Toronto. Rosedale Presbyterian to install minister

A minister who is building an organ and finds himself "coming home" to a West Chicago neighborhood will be installed Sunday as senior pastor of Rosedale Gardens United Presbyterian Church of Livonia.

The Rev. Gerald Cobleigh comes from the First United Presbyterian Church of Wyandotte to lead a church that has had interim pastors for several months since the departure of the Rev. Robert Taylor.

A Detroit native, Cobleigh grew up a block from West Chicago and was in one of the earlier Cody High School graduating classes.

"And I guess you see signs after making decisions, but having a home and church on that street gives me a feeling of coming home," he said. "Besides that, I felt most at home with the people of Rosedale Gardens the first Sunday my wife and daughters and I were there. We are all most pleased to be coming to this church."

THE INSTALLATION will be held at 7 p.m., with the Dr. Richard Dunkelberger, longtime pastor of Rosedale Gardens and a director of Presbyterian Village in Redford Township, serving as guest preacher.

Also participating will be the Rev. James Cannon, moderator of the Detroit Presbytery.

"Dr. Dunkelberger is a dear friend of mine — I was a year ahead of his son in seminary — and beloved by this congregation, and Jim Cannon is a person really important to the peace in this denomination, so I'm delighted both will be with us," said the new Livonian.

Cobleigh, his wife, Kay, and their daughters Heather and Katy moved into the Rosedale parsonage late in August after the call had been extended.

"We were anxious to get things fixed up, although the church people had been willing to help," he said, "and I was ready to begin work Sept. 1.

"This congregation has been very open about its needs and I want to get to work starting to meet them."

A valued possession that came with the family's belongings was a still unfinished organ the clergyman is building.

"I bought the plans for \$9," he said, "and I figure when it's done it may cost about \$2,500. But that includes buying tools I needed for it and a lot of stain that I also am using on furniture for the children's rooms."

COBLEIGH attended Wayne State for a term after finishing high school and then enlisted in the U.S. Air Force, serving with the Strategic Air Command at Bangor, Maine.

He worked on engines there and eventually helped run a school to train officers for Air Force exams.

During that time, he also taught in the base chapel and directed a children's choir there and was a ready listener for an evangelist who visited the base.

"Then I decided I had followed my own way long enough and somebody else had a better way, and he's been my boss ever since," he said of his decision to go into the ministry.

Back in his home church, Grandale Presbyterian in Detroit, he was advised to complete work at WSU, where he earned a degree in psychology in the next three years.

"Kay and I met in psychology class," he said. "We teamed up to pass and have been teamed up ever since."

They were married after graduation the summer of 1965, and then headed for Kentucky where Cobleigh earned a master of divinity degree from Louisville Seminary.

His first call was as assistant pastor at the Wyandotte church.

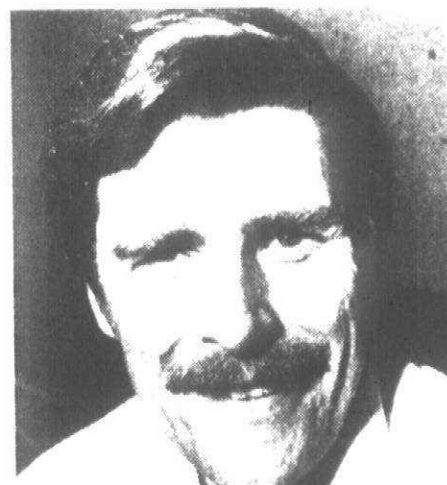
"About 18 months later, the senior pastor accepted another call," he said, "and later I was asked to take over."

That church, he said, was "hard to leave. It's quite a community — a very warm group," he added. "But I had a personal need for more challenge and stimulation, and I have learned that when I have strong feelings of this sort I should listen to them."

Of his new 1,333-member congregation, he said:

"Whatever their problems, they have the people to overcome them."

"In spite of the recent months of interim leadership, they have built a real continuity. I am looking forward to serving with them."

PRIME TIME

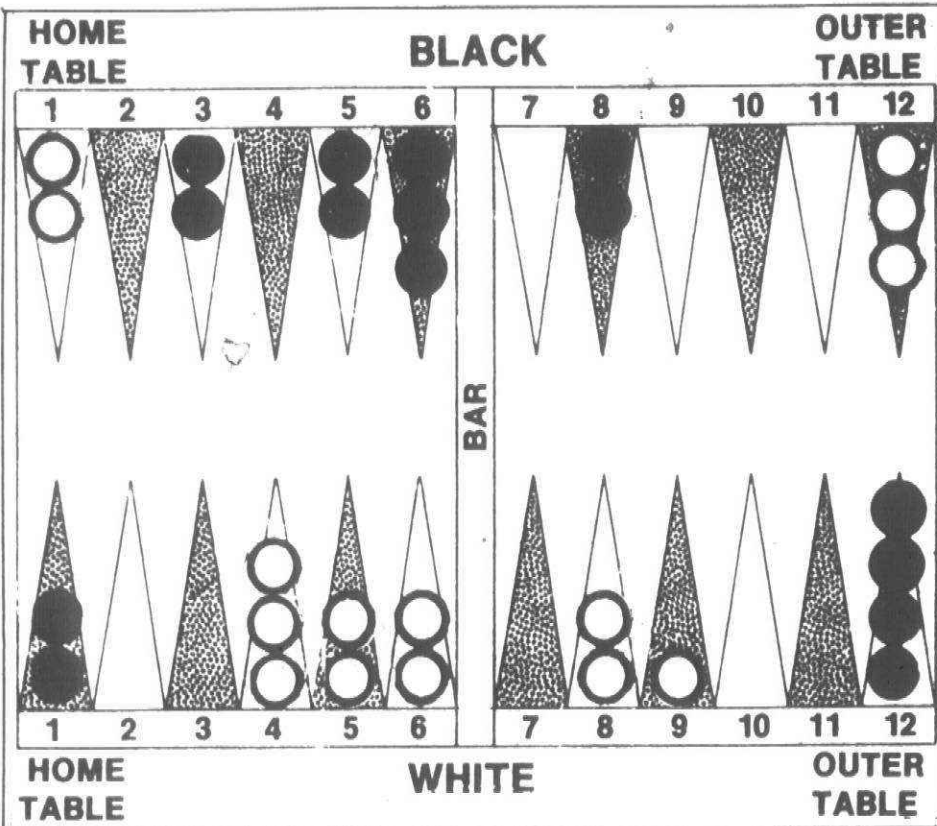
A basic objective in backgammon is to stop your opponent's forward progress by trapping his back men. This is done by closing (two or more checkers on any given point) four or five points in a row, preferably beginning with the 4 and 5 point through the 8 point.

The more points you "own," the more difficult it is for your opponent to bypass you. With six consecutive points closed, it is impossible for your opponent to run by. This is called a full prime.

In the position shown, white, on roll, has a 6-1 to play. How would you move?

Your first inkling might be to close the 3 point by moving a checker from the 9 and 4 points. This is fine since it fits in with the prime. However, moving to the 3 point will not stop your opponent from running with 6s.

I would close my 7 point with the 6-1 and leave a double indirect shot. The 7 point fits the prime just right, since you want to stop your opponent from



escaping. You can begin working at closing the 3 point next.

Although there is a "safe" play, leaving the open blots on the 8 and 9 is not as dangerous as it may seem. You now have the makings for a "full" prime and should, no doubt, win the game.

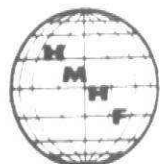

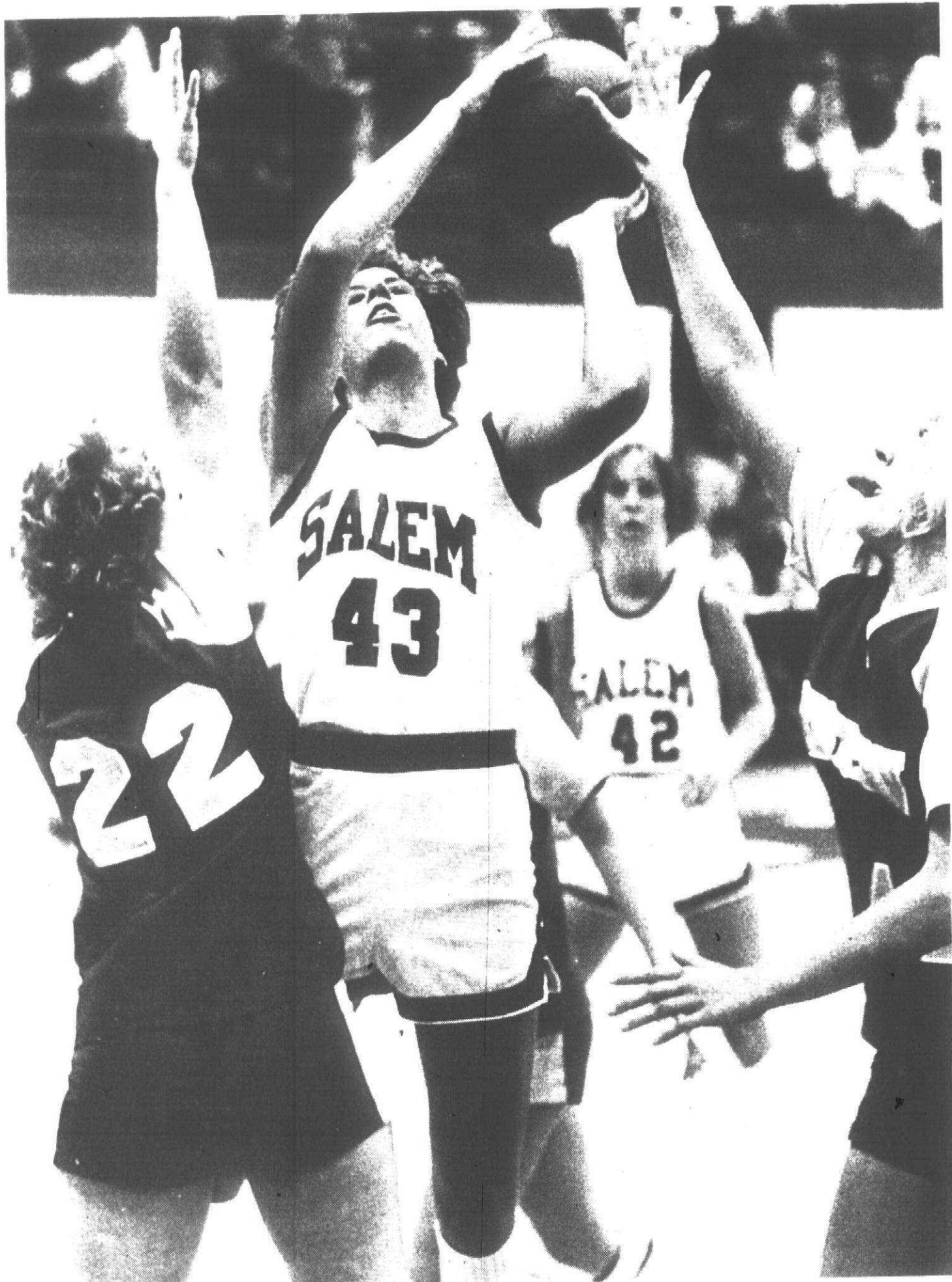

Salem cagers edge stingy Western, 51-48

Plymouth Salem coach Bob Blohm was glad to get it over.

He was relieved after his team came from behind Tuesday night at home in a tight 51-48 win over Walled Lake Western in the girls basketball season opener.

"It's going to be a dogfight for 20 games," predicted Blohm. "Give Walled Lake Western credit. Their coach has done a tremendous job. He's turned it around."

Blohm earned his pay. This was not just another easy traditional opener against Western. Two years ago Salem won by 32 points. Last season the spread was 22.

"I'm pleased," said Blohm, "because Western really made us work hard."

Salem, which posted a 17-7 record in 1979, trailed until the final quarter.

It was veteran center Cheryl Sobkow who lit Salem's fire.

She finished the game with 27 points and 21 rebounds. The 5-9 workhorse sparked the comeback with eight straight points.

"We tried to key on her," said Western coach Tom Szocinski. "Sobkow put the ball in with three and four people hanging all over her. I'm very, very impressed. She's All-State material. A team player."

"If it wasn't for her, we would have won."

DESPITE THE defeat, Szocinski was pleased with his team's performance and had a warning for another familiar opponent.

"I've got to be happy," he said. "This was no fluke. This is the third year for these girls together. They're starting to gel."

"I'm going to go out on limb and say Canton better watch out. I think we can stay with them."

Canton has won the Western Six League title, of which Walled Lake is a member, for four straight years.

"They made some awfully good shots," said Blohm of Western's accuracy from the floor. "We had a tremendous third quarter and (Bonnie) Southerland made some key passes into Cheryl. We have to continue to develop our depth."

Southerland, a junior guard, came off the bench late in the third quarter to spark the Rocks along with Sobkow.

The scrappy Western cagers led at halftime, 29-24, behind the sharpshooting of Janet Wilson and Kris Mellema. Salem followed in the third quarter by picking up the tempo. Sobkow's re-

bound basket with 12 seconds left in the period tied it up at 42-41.

In the fourth period, Sobkow grabbed a rebound and drove the length of the floor to give the Rocks a 44-42 advantage with seven minutes left. Salem never relinquished the lead, stalling for much of the final four minutes.

A basket by Wilson with 49 seconds remaining gave the Rocks some anxious moments, 49-48. Salem's Jacquie Merrifield was then fouled in the backcourt with 42 seconds left and missed the front end of a one-and-one free throw attempt.

Sobkow, however, grabbed the miss and scored to put the game away.

Wilson paced Western with 17 points. Mellema, who received several fast break passes from teammate Cindy Hart, added 15.

Eileen Moore and Jan MacKenzie had nine points apiece for Salem. The Rocks hit five of 11 from the free

throw line while Western connected on six of 13.

"The mark of a good team is the way they can come back," said Blohm. "Our guard play was decent defensively. The key to the game was how many layups did we miss?"

"We could have been up 14-4 in the first quarter. We just didn't square up enough."

Salem will not play again until Tuesday when it meets Dearborn Fordson on the road.

Seven runners from each school started the race just outside the stadium, three minutes to go before the half. Allen and Hand entered the track in olympic-like form just as the Bulldog band had left the field.

"He (Ron) came up with a nice idea," said Hayes. "I was real pleased by the response. When he called me it sounded like a fantastic idea."

Although the course was mapped out by Fedraw over a flat terrain and

through parts of a nearby subdivision, Hayes said his team "got pumped up about the whole idea."

"The kids thought it was kind of fun," he said. "It gives the student population a chance to see how hard they work."

"I think the interest is there and I'd like to do it on a regular basis. A lot of people liked it. At the end of the season I need to lay out a course for our team."

Canton will rely on senior Kim Massey, an at-large All-Observer swimmer. She has posted fast times in the 100-yard backstroke, 200-yard freestyle and 200-yard individual medley.

Canton coach Mark Griffith enters his second season with his team virtually intact. Mary Reardon, a senior freestyler, and Missy McMurray, a junior sprint freestyler, are veteran tankers who helped the Chiefs to a third place finish in the Western Six.

Brighton and Livonia Franklin figure to be near the bottom of the team standings, although the two teams have some fine individuals returning from last year who could make things interesting.

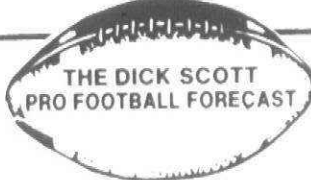

Jeff Haller of Stevenson gained sixth with a clocking of 17:36. Teammates Bob Clark and Keith Roznowski grabbed seventh and eighth with times of 17:39 and 17:41 respectively.

Other top finishes included Mike Talaga (PC), 10th, 18:01; Tim Granata (LS), 11th, 18:07; Barron Smith (PC), 12th, 18:13; Chris Whittaker (PS), 13th, 18:17; Dan Henry (PC), 14th, 18:22; Frank Brosnan (PS), 18:37.

Jones, who finished second, is only a freshman. Granata placed 11th after only two days of practice, according to Holmberg.

In the girls' race, Stevenson's Lori Bennett, an All-Observer track performer, led the Spartans to the team title by defeating Canton, 20-57.

Plymouth Salem entered only one runner — Ruth Sample — and she finished second with a time 20:26.

At Whispering Willows

Fore! Men eye O&E golf glory

A full field of 225 men will tee off beginning 7:30 a.m. Saturday in the first round of the 1980 Observer & Eccentric Golf Tournament.

The great majority will return to Whispering Willows Golf Course in Livonia the following day to complete the 36-hole tournament.

Three of four champions from last year's tourney will be back to attempt to defend their titles.

They include Jerry Thomas, a Livonia resident, Championship Flight; Richard Wheeler, Westland, Flight 1; and Tom Blazer, West Bloomfield, Flight 2.

The only titlist who did not register this year was Jack Quigley, a Westland resident who won the championship in Flight 3.

The vast majority of golfers will participate in the more-competitive Championship Flight and Flight 1.

"We have 83 in the Championship Flight and that's unheard of," said Gary Whitener, professional at Whispering Willows and the tournament director.

Whitener said that between 50 and 60 golfers have battled for honors in the Championship Flight in years past. Six-

ty started last year, but only 50 completed both rounds.

With only a small number of handicaps to be figured and flights to be assigned Monday, Whitener said that 72 golfers will compete in Flight 1, 40 in Flight 2 and 14 in Flight 3.

The flights, in which golfers of similar abilities compete for low gross (actual score) and low net (score figured with handicap) honors break down in the following manner:

- Championship Flight — 0 to eight handicap.
- Flight 1 — 9 to 14 handicap.
- Flight 2 — 15 to 21 handicap.
- Flight 3 — 22 and up handicap.

"We have an awful lot of familiar names who have been playing for years," Whitener said.

John Van Vleck, a Farmington Hills resident and two-time winner in the Championship Flight, returns as does Bill Curtis, a Farmington resident who has also won a title in the Championship Flight.

Glenn cage coach ousted by principal

Dan Henry, who coached Westland John Glenn to a 10-12 record last winter during his first season in charge of the varsity boys' basketball team, was relieved of his coaching duties last week by Thomas Svitekovich, principal at Glenn.

Henry had renewed his one-year basketball coaching contract in June. Coaching contracts in the Wayne/Westland Community Schools are extra work contracts and are renewed every year.

The Wayne-Westland Education Association filed a grievance against the school administration on behalf of Henry, who coached the JV basketball team three years before taking over the varsity when Gordie Davis resigned.

Bob Kowalczyk, executive director of the WWEA, said that in addition to the grievance, the WWEA would file an unfair labor practice charge against the Wayne/Westland Board of Education with the Michigan Employment Relations Commission.

The grievance alleges that the firing violated the "just cause" provision of the contract between the WWEA and the school board, Kowalczyk said.

The unfair labor charge is based upon that fact that Henry did not have union representation when he was dismissed as coach in a meeting with Svitekovich.

The unfair labor charge also alleges that Henry's working conditions have been changed in violation of the contract. Originally scheduled to teach one physical education class at Glenn and four at Stevenson Junior High, Henry now is assigned solely to Stevenson.

"We're seeking an injunction and restraining order (through Wayne County Circuit Court)," Kowalczyk said. "In other words, we're seeking to have him retained until this is adjudicated."

He added that the court action will be taken after the unfair labor practice charge is filed.
