## **Hospital plans local branch** Shovels dig in at complex site

56 Pages

Ground will be broken Tuesday in Canton for an emergency treatment and medical care facility of Dearborn's Oakwood Hospital.

However, building construction at Warren and Canton Center roads cannot begin until the Township Board approves site plans. The planning commission recommended approval of the plans last July 21.

The \$1.5 million building will include a 24-hour emergency room, a maternity clinic and outpatient facilities for family medical treatment. The center will not provide beds for in-hospital care.

DAVID IPPEL, administrative assistant of the new facility, hopes to receive site plan approval from the Township Board on Tuesday night and building permits the following day.

The ground-breaking ceremony will be held Tuesday afternoon.

Canton planner Jim Kosteva called the scheduled event "highly unusual," since site plan approval has not been given. But he foresees no problem in gaining approval.

"We thought we'd have all the paper- hour emergency care. Although emerwork done (in time for Tuesday's ceremonies)," said Ippel. "Things just got delayed a little."

Oakwood administrators hope to open the new medical center by fall of 1981

The center will provide a wide range of out-patient services, including 24-


gency surgery may be performed, Ippel said patients requiring hospitalization will be transferred to Oakwood or other full-service hospitals following stabilization.

Were the gunshots merely youthful vandalism, or was someone trying to tell a proposed group home for the retarded to go away?

Canton's police department has few details in its probe of a recent shotgun blast which put holes in the garage door and front of a house under construction on Maben Road, east of Beck.

The four-bedroom house is slated to be a group home for six mentally and physically handicapped youth between 10-17 years of age who previously lived in large institutions such as Plymouth Center for Human Development.

Operating the home will be Michigan Human Services, a non-profit corporation based in Ann Arbor. The corporation, which formerly was known as Pyramid Human Services, operates

Construction is expected to be finished this week, said builder Edward Murphey. However, no one can move in until the township completes final inspections and issues an occupancy permit. State fire and health inspectors also must check over the building and give their approval.

A POLICE report said the incident occurred sometime during the night or early morning of Sept. 9-10. No one was injured.

Also damaged was a tractor parked in the driveway, according to the report

"There isn't any information," said Police Lt. Larry Stewart. "Nobody saw or heard anything.

Broken windows have been repaired,

"And I hope we never have another one," he added.

"I THINK it's just a bunch of kids fooling around," said James Minder, executive director of Michigan Human

Services "No one has called or sent us threat-

ening letters," added Minder. Stewart disagrees. He believes 'someone has shown (his) disgust." Stewart said residents had expressed public meetings.

Ground never has been broken for The Center, a complex proposed for a 16-acre parcel on the east side of Haggerty, south of Ford. Site plan approval, first granted in 1977 and extended in 1978, expired last year.

Architect Ned Apigian is asking the Township Board to approve site plans again. Plans this time call for a scaleddown version of the original proposal and the elimination of indoor tennis courts.

The 155,000-square-foot facility would include four movie theaters, 18 racquetball courts, 72 bowling lanes, a restaurant, a bar, saunas and exercise equipment, a pro shop, a nursery and a barber shop.

Apigian says he may wait until late November when a new Township Board takes office before pursuing his request for site plan approval and a reduction in the 400-seat requirement.

The planning commission has recommended a change in the requirement, according to assistant planner Dave Nicholson. But the Township Board turned down the requested change last week.

By November, lame duck Trustee Robert Greenstein will lose his seat on the board. Apigian maintains that Greenstein has made construction of project difficult.

**Education chief tours area, addresses woes**

Mom and Dad can't expect any help from the Carter Administration when writing out tuition checks.

Departing from the Democratic party platform, Secretary of Education Shirley M. Hufstedler said, "The President and I have taken a firm position (saying) no to tax credits for education.

"We recognize that many do need relief, and that many private school settings are hard pressed," she said. "But we cannot permit the whole public school system to be damaged or torn down."

She discussed the role of the new

While affirming a commitment to public schools, Mrs. Hufstedler offered no federal help to districts such as Livonia, Birmingham, Southfield and Wayne-Westland, which are facing declining enrollments and closed schools.

"We've done a great deal of looking at declining enrollment. It's a spotty problem," she said. "It's deceptive because there is a sharp decline in some districts while enrollment is rising in others, especially those with our newest immigrants.

"I hope the people in Michigan understand how wise it is to use school sites for multiple community uses other than education. In a number of years there will be a demographic

tion when that cabinet position was created May 4, added that her department would "try even harder to provide equal educational access to non-public schools" in such areas as programs for the handicapped.

EQUAL ACCESS to education was repeatedly emphasized by Mrs. Hufstedler. The daughter of a migrant worker, she recalls having attended 12 schools during a period of seven years.

"I hear talk about schools in the good, old days, when skies were blue and school was in a little red building. That was about 1950.

"Well, they weren't blue, it wasn't

really good at all except for the handful of kids who were wealthy."

Mrs. Hufstedler, an associate justice in the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals before tackling her new role, said she plans to help achieve "educational equity" by finding "different ways to copy the best programs in the U.S. . . . We need to be cooperational, not confrontational."

Asked by one student during a town meeting at John Glenn High if busing students justified the cost of fuel it takes. Mrs. Hufstedler said, "Whether it is expensive or not is beside the point.

"When we have a guarantee of equal access to education, (the guar-

ANOTHER STUDENT asked her to comment on economist Milton Friedman's proposed voucher system, in which students would be given a set amount to be used at the school of their choice.

"He's flat wrong," she said. "We'd be using public money to support private schools. How would we rebuild public schools? Who would get left behind and left out?

"We do need to give some help to private schools. Milton Friedman may know about economics, but he knows nothing about private schools," Mrs. Hufstedler said.



Safety course set for hunters

A safety program for hunters will be offered next month to youngsters in Wayne County between the ages of 111/2 and 15.





### Dog is neighborhood pet 'Hobo' needs a home

Hobo has spent the last three months pretty much bumming around - hitting the garage sales, eating handouts and napping under clumps of bushes.

But winter is coming, and residents of the Hanford-Southampton area of Canton think it's high time Hobo - a stray, long-haired dog of mixed breed - has a permanent home

Neighbors say the dog began hanging around about three months ago. They fed him, and he played with neighborhood children.

They dubbed him "Hobo," and he soon responded to the name. But with no tags and no collar, residents were unable to track down his owner

"HE HAS been in and out of the neighborhood, said Irene Robitaille of Southampton. "He is like a neighborhood pet. With the cold weather coming, I sure would like to see him have a good home.

Mrs. Robitaille and her husband Raymond are one of several families who have been caring for Hobo, who has dark hair with golden highlights.

"He looks very healthy, about a

year or two old," continued Mrs. Robitaille. "He's had training. He's playful (but) shy. He may have had abuse.

Over the summer, Hobo managed to wriggle into the affections of the neighbors. Sharon Palise, also of Southampton, said she didn't really pay much attention to the stray at first. Then one day she was out jogging and stopped at a garage sale.

"HERE WAS this dog lying on the ground watching the people," said Mrs. Palise. "One lady says whenever the garage door is open, he gets

"People play with him and he nips heels," she continued. "Another says he protects her house.

Mrs. Palise says many neighbors already have dogs and "nobody can keep" Hobo. One resident put an ad in the newspaper, but Hobo's owner didn't step forward.

Last week, Mrs. Palise called the township police, who agreed to pick up the dog if it was in a confined area. The woman in whose yard Hobo was staying refused to cooperate.

"She said he would be destroyed," said Mrs. Palise. "Here I think I'm doing a good job getting the dog off the street before winter

CANTON POLICE Lt. Larry Stewart confirmed there is one fulltime animal control officer. Augmenting his efforts are police cadets or patrol officers.

Stewart said the police department tries to trace animals' owners through tags. But strays "always, categorically" are taken to the Michigan Humane Society shelter in Westland

The animal shelter generally holds the animals for four days, in case the owner comes in to claim it. After that, the animal is put up for adoption or destroyed.

Stewart said there is a dart gun which can be used to anesthetize and subdue an animal. However, correct dosage of the anesthetic depends on size and weight of the animal

Stewart said only animal control officer John Swalley has been trained and certified to use the dart gun

ANIMALS WHICH have been injured or which are considered vicious or "not apprehendable" may be taken away and shot, said Stewart

Persons who might know Hobo's owner, or who are interested in having the dog for a pet, may call Mrs. Palise for information at 459-2415.

Suburban group takes control of lunch plan

The administration of the senior citizen nutrition programs for Plymouth, Canton, and 32 other western Wayne County and downriver suburbs will be taken over by Livonia beginning Oct. 1.

The nutrition program had been administered for some seven years by the Detroit-Wayne County Area Agency on Aging.

That agency, though, lost the right to administer the nutrition program after losing out in a dispute with a recently

formed Out-County Area Agency on Aging.

Livonia Mayor Edward McNamara was among the suburban officials who led the movement to establish the outcounty group last year.

The splinter group was formed after a squabble developed between several suburban leaders - including Wayne County Commissioner R. William Joyner, D-Plymouth, and Canton officials - and Dante DiVitto, director of the original agency.

The nutrition program provides hot meals to senior citizens from the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township. Plymouth seniors can receive the meals by stopping at Tonquish Creek Manor or by arranging for delivery by the city's van to homebound citizens.

In Canton senior citizens can come to the Canton Recreation Hall at Michigan Avenue and Sheldon for the meals.

JOAN DUGGAN, director of the Livonia Community Resource Department, said Livonia will use the structure and staff which already is in place at 45 food service sites.

The switch will only involve a change in the administration of the hot lunch program, she added

The time and place of meal service in Canton and Plymouth, and throughout Wayne County will remain the same

At a stormy board of directors meet-Agency on Aging group selected the city of Livonia's proposal for the \$1 million nutrition grant funded by the federal government. The proposal calls for a monitoring committee comprised of local mayors and township supervisors and other representatives to review the results

Canton also delivers a few meals to and provide a plan to take over the program in October 1981.

> McNamara, who also serves as chairman of the out-county group, said Livonia was reluctant to take over the nutrition program

> Livonia will take the lead in establishing a new administra tion, McNamara added, because of what he called "mismanagement" and "poor performance" by DiVitto.

> McNamara has pledged to improve and expand the program under his city's directorship.

The out-county agency, backd up by a field representative from the state office on aging, maintained, however, that DiVitto's application was faulty in that it was not approved by a vote of the full Wayne County Board of Commissioners

That opinion also was shared by George Cross, attorney for Wayne County Commissioners.

DiVitto charged that his agency was being "shunted out of the process." He said the out-county agency's staff decision was inappropriate and he delivered a plea to board members to reverse the staff decision.

DiVitto said he was never notified that there was any problem with the county grant applications and added he planned to appeal the out-county agency's decision. "After seven years, this is a pretty shabby way to be treated." he said. "This is obviously a grab for the program.

STATE LAW permits such homes in single-family areas. Two similar facilities cannot be within 1,500 feet of each other, however.

Murphey said the Maben Road house will accommodate both ambulatory and wheelchair-bound clients. For ex-

ample, hallways are six feet wide, doors open out and bathrooms and kitchen easily accessible.

Apigian has received a string of zoning variances from the Zoning Board of Appeals in order to build The Center. Variances expire after six months, and site plan approvals expire after one year

Apigian said staggered termination dates of variances and site plans have prevented construction of The Center. The developers encountered some difficulty in obtaining financing for the project, he said.

UNLESS A NEW seating requirement for movie theaters is changed, Apigian says Greenstein may get his "death wish" for a bowling alley - an authorized use in a commercial zoning center.

The requirement for a minimum 400 seats in every movie theater is contained in a zoning ordinance approved by the Township Board last spring.

The requirement was adopted to discourage the development of X-rated movie houses in Canton. Township officials maintain that small movie theaters often become pornographic centers when business declines.

She said that she strongly supports collective bargaining, but that she was unfamiliar with attempts at regional bargaining here.

IMMEDIATE GOALS for the education department include, according to Mrs. Hufstedler, getting the Youth Act of 1980 and a vocational education act through Congress. The youth act, which has passed the House and goes before the Senate this week, would provide \$2 billion a year for junior and senior high school youth as well as those out of school, she said.

Mrs. Hufstedler visited Wayne-Westland because, she said, it offered programs in which she was interested. The department of education has assumed the theme of life-long learning. That's a concept being developed in the district through a vocational-social service center which, when completed, will offer child care, an expanded senior citizen program, vocational education and a respite care center for the handicapped.

"All kinds of things look great on paper. I'm delivering a speech in Detroit tomorrow (last Tuesday), and I wanted to see for myself," she said, adding that the visit also was an opportunity to campaign for President Carter.

Apigian's plans for The Center call for four movie theaters with differing seating capacities of 250 to 425.

"When I was in the middle of redesigning, they adopted a new ordinance which complicated my life," said Apigian.

"It's obvious to me the requirement wasn't well thought out. They aren't looking at reality," he said of the Township Board. "They might as well say that all cars that come into Canton have to be three-wheelers."

Apigian says movie, exhibitors would refuse to lease space in The Center if the 400-seat requirement sticks. He maintains that all new multi-screen theaters contain some rooms with less than 400 seats. The range in seating capacity allows exhibitors to show popular movies in large rooms and less popular films in smaller theaters.

According to Nicholson, the planning commission has recommended changing the 400-seat requirement

Under the suggestion, 750 seats would be required for a one-screen theater, an average 400 seats per screen for a two-screen theater, an average 350 per screen for three, and an average 250 per screen for four

Apigian maintains that Greenstein's opposition to his project swung the Township Board in its denial of the seating requirement change.

He says the project "has been made a political football.'

"WE CAME IN with a multi-million dollar project, and we assumed people would think it was a good one for the township. I assumed I was dealing with rational, intelligent people.

"It's innately nasty," he said of the township's reaction to his project. "I don't understand that mentality. We are puzzled by this attitude that we're trying to build a horror house.'

Apigian said he dropped tennis courts from plans for The Center because of the Township Board's refusal last year to extend a liquor license allocation previously granted.

At the time, board members expressed concern that The Center would never be built.

Greenstein and Apigian have engaged in verbal warfare on the occasions they publicly have met.

"How has Bob Greenstein screwed him up?" Greenstein asks.

"The man has asked for more variances than for five other projects combined. When he finally has every approval that's ever been needed in the history of the world, he finds some other reason why he can't build.

"If he really wanted movie theaters, he wouldn't let it go down. This building is being built according to specifications," Greenstein said.

## W-W budget buys less

### By SANDRA ARMBRUSTER

If you're a high school student planning on taking a driver's education course during the school year, forget it.

Wayne-Westland school board members unanimously approved a budget that will delay driver's education instruction until summer. The district includes the southeastern portion of Canton Township.

But that may not be the only disappointment for students, parents and teachers operating under the \$51.9 million budget this year.

The new budget represents a 5.79 percent increase over last year, and reflects a loss of more than \$1.8 million in expected revenue.

Hospital work looms

The approval came recently after the board held a public hearing on the budget which was attended only by two reporters and administrators. "It seems we're spending more mon-

ey with less students and getting a little less for it," said board trustee Fred Warmbier in summarizing the budget picture.

"We don't disagree with you," said Superintendent Timothy Dyer. "We're trying to keep afloat with a minimal increase while inflation is at 13 percent.

Dyer said one example of increasing inflation is a 33 percent increase in the cost of Blue Cross fringe benefits the district will have to pay out during this budget year.

THE REVENUE picture could worsen, for the district. Board members and administrators emphasized the budget was a "plan to spend" that could be amended

Dver said a fourth cut in state aid to the district could come next March.

Other factors which could affect school district revenue include a property tax appeal by Ford Motor Co. and declining enrollment. The tax appeal could cost the district \$50,000, but a count of students on the first Friday in school showed an estimate of only 139 lower than anticipated and those are expected to be recouped. That means the district's estimates of state aid per pupil ought to be accurate, baring any further cuts ordered by the Legislature or governor.

Marty had some other problems like cleft soft palate and coxvere joints of the hip. But none of them impeded her progress through school or teen activities like learning to drive. (She uses a couple of pillows and extensions on the foot pedals, but went through driver training right on schedule.)

It was Marty herself who brought the family into the foundation. She keeps in touch with Dr. Hopwood, who recommended its activities.

"From what I can see, it's a terrific organization," said the teen. She also gets literature now from the Little People of America.

Why the interest now? "I'd like to help them," she said.

'There are so many people with growth problems, and some don't have the attitude they should."

Women dig geology in record numbers

# Myths of gifted to be attacked

An attempt to dispel the stereotyped myths surrounding gifted children will be made by the guest speaker appearing at the next meeting of the Plymouth-Canton Association for the Academically Talented (PCAAT).

Sandra Warren, an Ohio consultant and advocate for gifted education, will be the speaker at the Oct. 8 meeting of PCAAT.

The meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. in Pioneer Middle School on Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth Township.

Her presentation, "Shattering the Pedestal," is geared to further describe the characteristics of exceptional young people

As the mother of two gifted children, and as an organizer and leader of Ohio's community and regional organizations. Mrs. Warren has found definitive discrepancies between society's expectations of its exceptional youngsters and their actual performance.

Her research and anecdotal accounts provide solace to teachers and parents whose TAG youngsters are not models of behavior

All interested parents and educators are invited to attend and hear Mrs. Warren address the PCAAT in October.

THE GROUP held its first meeting in September and heard a presentation from Dr Donald Hadley, a clinician and consulting psychologist.

Gifted education was a topic of concern as early as 1931, he said, when a curriculum handbook urged educators to recognize giftedness, "the greatest characteristic and capability to create this is the highest activity, the great heritage of the capable pupil and the chief reason why we can ill afford to neglect him.

During his talk, Dr. Hadley described the inadequacies of present-day tools and techniques for identifying gifted children

The quality of giftedness itself has

lately been more broadly defined but Dr. Hadley sees it as a continuum rather than a measurable point on an arbitrary scale

Today's exceptional child may well fulfill the 1931 definition's requirement, said Hadley, bacause he may exhibit a high degree of achievement in a specific talent and he, hopefully, will evince a humanistic quality enriching the lives of those around them.

Preceding Dr. Hadley's talk, Dr. Michael Homes, assistant superintendent for instruction for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, addressed the audience to assure them of the administration's continuing concern about finding a TAG director to replace Rick Olenchak.



The number of women geology graduate students has doubled in the past five years at The University of Michigan.

Since 1975, the proportion of women has risen from one-sixth to one-third of the graduate student population in the U-M department of geological sciences.

"The is a dramatic increase over their enrollment in all the years since the 1920s, during which women averaged one tenth or less of our graduate student body," reports Prof. William C. Kelly, department chairman.

During 1979-80, 13 of the 36 students in the master's degree program and four of the 16 Ph.D. candidates were women. For 1980-81, the ratio appears to be similar with the total number of graduate students increasing to 63, Kelly says.

The only other time in U-M history when increased numbers of women

studied geology was during World War II, he notes. However, very few entered graduate school for research and professiona training in the various and expanding subdisciplines of geology.

"One primary reason for the current increase," Kelly says, "is the energy industry's growth in demand for petroleum geologists, which has made job opportunities for women more available and lucrative than ever before.

"But the basic impact on the availability of jobs for women in geology, historically a male-dominated profession, can be attributed to the changing of attitudes in industry," he says.

"As company managements have seen more and more women competently handling jobs that they thought could only be done by men, they have liberalized their views about sending female representatives into the field.

### Church in trouble, says new minister

Unless the Methodist church of today can reverse some of its current trends it is in for a lot of trouble.

That is the opinion of the Rev. John Grenfell Jr., recently installed at First United Methodist Church of Plymouth.

Sitting in his office on North Territorial Road, he was quick to identify the trends and then admitted that his church had a rough road ahead.

"First," he said, "we must reverse the membership decline. We must work, and work hard, to focus the young people's attention to the church and have them become affiliated. They have been allowed to drift away.

"Next, we must stress the importance of the family. We must make of it a strong part of the nation. That isn't so today.

## Tisch tax cut would be a bomb-Bonner

Wayne State University President Thomas N. Bonner compares passage of the Tisch tax cut proposal to the effect of an atomic bomb being dropped on campus

Like 14 other public university presidents across Michigan, Bonner is working with several unknown factors as he prepares his budget for fiscal 1980-81, which begins Oct. 1.

For the first time since 1939, state

revenues are running behind expenditures at WSU. There's also strong likelihood of cuts in the state budget for education without regard to inflation or the myriad of tax cut proposals on the Nov. 4 ballot.

WSU, which serves a clientele of mostly tri-county area students, could live with other tax cut proposals like the Smith-Bullard plan or the Coalition Proposal, Bonner says, but not with Tisch.



major universities in Michigan," said Bonner.

If the plan initiated by Shiawassee County Drain Commissioner Robert Tisch passes, it would cut \$2 billion from state coffers. Unlike the Smith-Bullard plan or Coalition Proposal which would both cut property taxes and increase other taxes, Tisch offers no alternative for making up lost revenues.

THAT MEANS SCHOOLS like Wayne State which rely primarily on state funds (72 percent of the current budget) would get little or no state support.

"If Tisch passes as written, some public universities will close," Bonner predicts. "A few selected universities might survive, but Wayne won't be one of them

"Our emphasis now is to defeat Tisch.

Bonner, who began his third year as WSU president in August, has been an admitted publicity hound for the university, the third largest public university in the state, since his arrival.

He has traveled to Poland. China. Romania and Nigeria to establish student exchange programs. On the home front, he has talked up the university's urban aspects, its image as a labor-, industrial- and culturally-priented school.

Tisch poses the greatest threat to that image.

"It's such a disaster, like dropping an atomic bomb on the university," Bonner says.

WSU's 1979-80 general fund budget included \$98 million in state aid. The next biggest slice of the financial pie, \$35 million, was generated by tuition. Bonner would be hard pressed to

raise tuition again, since a major priority this year is to reduce present tui-


tion, which is among the highest in the country while at the same time serving a student population that is older, parttime and less affluent than others.

"IF WE RAISED tuition, it would have to be up to the level of a private university to keep pace, about \$4,500 a year," Bonner said.

"That would put us out of business." The school's ever-spiraling tuition currently ranges from \$1,400 a year for undergraduates to \$1,550 a year for graduate level courses.


Bonner thinks the switch from a quarter system to semesters and the current recession could have an adverse affect on admissions, which jumped to 34,500 last fall - up from the previous two years.

"Everything depends on recovery of the economy," Bonner says. "We're hoping for considerable recovery next spring."



## Lobbyists tell how tax proposals affect schools

#### **By LEONARD POGER**

Public schools will be affected in the pocketbook by two major tax proposals on the ballot

A third proposal, sponsored by Robert Tisch to cut property taxes in half, may not make it on the Nov. 4 ballot following an Ingham County circuit court ruling Thursday.

That ruling said that there were legal deficiencies in the Tisch proposal. Tisch is sure to appeal that decision. If he wins his appeal, the tax plan could be placed on the November ballot.

But public school officials generally are not as united in opposition to tax

when they opposed Tisch and two other tax plans.

One apparent reason is that they are unsure of the specific impact of how the proposals, if approved by voters, would affect them.

FOR EXAMPLE, a group of Western Wayne County school districts agreed two months ago to formally oppose the Tisch plan but will "wait until the smoke clears" before taking a position on the other plans.

That group is the Michigan Associa-

proposals as they were two years ago tion of Improved Legislation, a special interest group made up of nine school districts, including Livonia, Plymouth-Canton, Garden City, Wayne-Westland, and Redford Union.

> One plan, called the Smith-Bullard proposal after its legislative sponsors, would reduce most property taxes, initiate a state-wide property tax of about half the current rate, and institute a 1 percent state income tax for education. The new state-wide property tax would replace all current property taxes for local schools.

Voters could approve up to 10 mills (\$10 per \$1,000 of state equalized valu-

ation) in local taxes and/or levy a local income tax to supplement the statewide property tax for local education.

Another plan, put together by the governor's office and legislative leaders, would substantially reduce property taxes and raise funds through an increase in the state sales tax.

**BUT THE MICHIGAN Association of** School Boards has gone on record as opposing all three proposals. (The group's board of directors unanimously opposed the three plans Aug. 29, a week before the Tisch proposal was blocked from the ballot by the Ingham court ruling.)

The MASB said that while the Tisch plan would be the more severe in reducing of school revenues, the other two plans wouldn't represent any improvement in the current state tax system.

The MASB board, acting on recommendations from a committee which spent several months reviewing the tax proposals, said two criteria must be considered in any recommendations.

One is that a tax system must provide adequate revenues to fund services by state and local governments. The other is that the taxes available to governmental units must provide a stable source of revenue.

The problems with the Smith-Bullard and gubernatorial-legislative leadership proposals are that they depend on income tax and sales tax revenues.

Those two sources are subject to fluctuations depending on the economic conditions

If there is a recession and reduction in state revenues, both the state and local schools will share in the loss, the MASB said.

The gubernatorial-legislative proposal, some school officials say, would only replace one tax with another, keeping the available state revenues for education the same as before





## Preparing for musical excellence

During the next three weeks a series of articles will appear that will attempt to explain to the non-marching band enthusiast what goes on during a high school marching band competition. Part one of the series will deal with the marching and maneuvering aspect and the timing and penalty element of the competition.

For most, the mention of a marching band brings to mind football game half-time shows and pep assembly fight songs. But for the members of the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) Marching Band, football games play only a small part of a schedule booked solid with not only football games for Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton High Schools but five marching band competitions as well.

Prior to the start of the school year an entire week was spent at a northern Michigan camp to devote both time and energy to learning both music and drill that when combined result in a competition show that will be judged in seven categories including marching and maneuvering, timing, musical effect, musical execution, percussion, color guard and visual effect. Included in the judging team, one judge will be responsible for timing and penalties. This judge appears on the performance field along with the band and is identifiable by the stopwatch and warning gun carried throughout the performance of each band.

## Keep on walking How to live to ripe old age

If you would like to live to a ripe old age, say in the 90s, just keep walking and walking and walking.

That's the advice of J. Charles Miller, the kindly old gent with the tan hat who can be seen every afternoon during nice weather sitting on a bench in Kellogg Park.

Known to his friends as plain "Charlie," he tries to walk two miles each day, and he recently passed his 91st birthday.

"I walk from my home at 294 W. Ann Arbor Trail to Kellogg Park," he said, "and when the weather is suitable (not too hot), I walk the length of Union Street from the park to the old Daisy Air Rifle building and then around the block until I find myself back home.

"And do you know, I don't recall being sick a day in my life. So I would advise everyone to keep walking, if it is only a bit each day."

Aside from his prowess as a walker at his age, "Charlie" has another distinction of which he is very proud.

**HE IS** one of the last — if not the last — of the oldtime broom makers. And he scoffs at the way brooms are made today on the production lines.

Born in St. Thomas, Canada, on July 29, 1889, he was forced to leave school when 13. His job was making brooms.


"They weren't so particular about hiring young people

in those days, so  $\mathbf{1}$  had no trouble getting the factory job and the chance to learn the broom-making trade."

In 1905, he made the trip to Detroit for the first time to seek work. It wasn't long until he had mastered the craft so well that he traveled about the country plying his trade.

"Yes, I traveled to St. Louis, Chicago and later to Cleveland. And today I wouldn't know where to look for a broom factory."

All the while, he kept walking and seriously tells you that he often stepped from the bus a few blocks from home each day he worked so he could walk the rest of the distance.



EACH BAND will be in competition for a minimum length of time to a maximum time of 11 minutes, six seconds which must be in motion. Time begins with the first note of music or drum beat of movement of the band after its warm-up.

Marching and maneuvering judges also work on the performance field and check uniformity and precision of the drill. The is a category judged for the first eight minutes of the bands' performance and is concluded at the sound of a double gun.

In the division of marching and maneuvering, one judge views the band from the width of the field as another judge evaluates the drill from the length of the field.

Intervals between players, distance between ranks and improper dress of squads or cover of files (straightness of lines) are typical areas that the judges evaluate.

Any error however slight means a penalizing mark or tick from the judge, which is counted as a loss of one-tenth of a point.

A band may receive a tick for such things as a player out of step, for those who fail to pick up their feet or step off uniformly with other members of the band or section, or for those who are sloppy in their bearing or execution of the drill.

In addition to ticks, however, a marching and maneuvering judge may give up to three points credit to the band for patterns and movements which allow for easy evaluation. The total number of ticks are subtracted from the perfect 100 point score and then exposure to evaluation points are added. The category has a point value of 20 points.

TIMING AND judging in other categories of evaluation conclude upon the field commander's salute. Bands under or over the time allotment will be penalized one point for each minute fraction thereof.

Penalties recorded by judges may include such infractions as dropped equipment (flags, rifles, drum sticks) or anyone stepping over the finish or exit line (sidelines) other than the field commanders prior to the eight minute gun.

Preparation by both members of the CEP Marching Band and the band's booster club is currently being made for a number of competitions in which the band will participate.


The first of these competitions is slated for Sept. 27 with the third annual Clarkston Invitational.

Other dates on the band's schedule include the Marching Bands of America Northern Regional (Oct. 4), the Michigan Invitational (Oct. 5), the Durand Invitational (Oct. 18) and the Cavalcade of Bands at Western Michigan University (Oct. 25).

Those interested in viewing the CEP band in action other than at Friday night football game can catch the first CEP Invitational Marching Band Competition starting at 6:30 p.m. Oct. 11 on the CEP football field.

Tickets are \$2.50 at the gate or \$2 when purchased in advance. Ticket outlets include the Trading Post, Sideways, The Health Shoppe or any band director in the Plymouth-Canton Community School District.

## Geer School celebrates its centennial Sunday

Geer Elementary School will celebrate its centenial with an open house from 3-5 p.m. Sept. 21. The following is the second of a threepart reprint of the History of Geer School written in 1974 by Mary Louise Harwood for the Landmarks Committee of the Plymouth branch of the American Association of University Women.


Geer School finally became a legally graded school in 1903, according to Section 4746 of Michigan Compiled Laws. It also established a library which really was just a large glass enclosed bookcase with a few volumes placed in the southwest corner of the building.

"Graded" meant a certain degree of advancement a child made in his studies regardless of age or fixed time he attended school. Geer consisted of nine grades: beginners through eighth. Stu-

dents graduated from the 8th grade and then went on to high school in Plymouth paying tuition.

A more humorous problem of the time was the honey bees. They had built their hive in the chimney in the 1920s. John Root, now the director of the school board, climbed to the roof and with protective equipment cleaned the chimney and obtained enough honey for himself and the other board members for the following winter.

Painting the inside of the school seemed to pose a problem. The board would not appropriate enough money to buy paint one year so the Mother's Club painted the school a bright pink and blue. The following year the board insisted they purchase new beige interior paint. The year was 1935. During this same time, teacher Esther Gale. disgusted with the school board and uncooperative parents, sent her end-ofthe-year report. "Our school needs: a

All but one of her requests were granted, even an electric bell, and more - a piano, a phonograph and a radio. One demand

not granted - Esther Gale stayed on at Geer School until 1937. Geer School once rang in its scholars with a large old bell. That bell cracked and the local blacksmith was to fix it. Its whereabouts are unknown.

Sometime during the 1930s the wood coal furnace in the classroom was moved down to the newly dug basement. When the classroom became uncomfortably cold in the dead of winter, the teacher took her students to the basement where they held classes around the furnace. Here the first "hot" lunch was baked; potatoes placed on wide ledges of the furnace itself, baked in time for lunch at noon. The teacher and older students built and

kept the fires and cleaned the school at the end of each day. The floor was oiled hardwood. The first sink was installed during this time. Eighth grade graduation was held in May with each graduate receiving a silver dollar.

THE STUDENTS earned monies with which to buy all their toys, games and sport equipment. Walnuts were gathered and sold in the 1940s. Scrap drives, ice cream socials, movies by admission and white elephant sales were all popular money-making ideas.

In the school year 1943-44 the students of Geer purchased enough war savings stamps and bonds to pay for a jeep. On the last day of school, May 19, 1944, a soldier brought a new jeep to school so that every child might have a ride. Miss Marilyn McClumpha, now Mrs. Marr, was the teacher.

Christmas 1944 children's program had to be cancelled. School was closed in December due to sickness.

Good times were many at the red brick schoolhouse. Quilts were quilted and then raffled, box socials were fol-

ing place for the whole community. Gifts were made and packed for the boys and girls in the service. A service flag was sewn. The first music teacher was hired in 1945 by each family paying her \$1 per month for her services. The first 4-H club was organized here in 1949. All neighbors were remembered during illnesses by the Flower Fund Committee. Yearly dues were 25 cents per adult payable to the PTO. Parent Teacher Organization meetings were always followed with either bingo, bunco or euchre. Annually, every fall, the school had a Thanksgiving dinner

Often at Christmas time every student brought something to place in a basket arranged by the students to be given to a needy family in the community.

It was during the winter of 1946 that Mr. Bennett came to school and made an ice skating rink for the children on the west side of the building. Before road served as their skating area.

Bad weather at Christmas 1951 postponed the children's program until January. A school census was taken each spring by a person from the community knocking on every door tabulating the ages of all children therein. In 1952 the walls were bulging with 40 children, beginners through eighth grade. The teacher then, Mrs. Ruby Bunn, asked for help. Two mothers assisted with the beginners - Mrs. Orville Dunson and Mrs. Robert Sumption. Children bought their own workbooks and rented their textbooks - \$1 for beginners, \$2 first (1974) was planted on Arbor Day 1961.

lowed with dancing. It was the gather- through fifth and \$3 sixth through eighth.

During the year of 1954, the seventhand eighth-graders joined the ninth-10th-, 11th- and 12th-graders in the Plymouth Schools as tuition students. It was at this time the first thoughts of expanding the building were taken seriously.

During the 1957-58 school year the children had penny suppers, paper drives, sold Christmas cards, had movies and gave plays to earn money. The goal was to rent a real helicopter that would take them for a ride over each child's home. It landed on the lawn of Leo Kubic, east of the school on March 14, 1958. That same money-making class of busy beavers boarded an airplane (Viscount-Capital) at Willow Run Airport and flew to Lansing. They had lunch at the Roosevelt Hotel. The teacher was Mrs. Gloria Hummel.

Every year ended with a school picnic at Superior Township Hall, followed with a ball game. The children that the packed snow on Gotfredson and Mrs. Hummel made a school annual - Geer Schooldaze 1957 - and dedicated it to Mrs. Ruby Bunn

It was 1959-60 that a petition was circulated for the need of two teachers and building improvements. Mr. Jerry Vetesse was contracted to add a second room to the one-room brick schoolhouse. The school year 1960-61 found the new room complete and housed its first class of beginners, first-, secondand third-graders.

New shrubbery for landscaping was donated by the Lionel Guregian family. An evergreen still standing today

# Supporting symphony is money well spent

Everyone suffers during tough economic times. Community orchestras are no exception.

Business and industry typically tie their orchestral contributions to profits, which have fallen sharply.

There is still the threat of the Tisch ballot proposal. If it passes, the Michigan Council for the Arts can expect a drastic budget reduction.

The Plymouth Symphony Orchestra relies on both funding sources in addition to contributions from individual citizens.

Membership fees range in price from \$10 for a senior citizen to \$500 for a sponsor. All membership categories include season tickets. A husband and wife can enjoy all six of the orchestra's concerts this year by purchasing a \$35 membership.

THAT MAY seem like a lot of money when news

of layoffs and recession constantly are bombarding our lives.

But it's money well-spent.

As Antal Dorati put it recently: "A great city needs a great orchestra." He was speaking of Detroit, but his words are just as true for Plymouth and Canton.

When you speak of community orchestras, the Plymouth Symphony can be counted among the most respected. Its mere existence attests that residents are interested in good music.

Its concerts are close to home. There's no need to drive to Detroit or Ann Arbor to enjoy live symphonic performances.

It introduces the young to fine music from the classical, baroque or romantic periods of composition. It provides an inexpensive means of expanding a child's horizon past television and cartoons.

It is a great outlet for local performers, who, for one reason or another, were unable to become fulltime musicians themselves.

It is a first showcase for our more talented high school and college musicians. It provides opportunity to rub shoulders with adult musicians, accompany professional soloists and be heard by someone other than fellow students and parents.

Most importantly, the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra is a cultural asset to the area.

THE ORCHESTRA will open its 35th season Oct. 12 in Plymouth Salem High School Auditorium. The program includes Beethoven's Leonore Overture No. 3, Brahms' Symphony No. 2 and Hummel's Concerto for Trumpet with soloist Armando A. Ghitalla.

At the helm will be a new conductor - Johan van


der Merwe, who has conducted in Europe, South Africa and the United States. He takes over after a year of guest conductors following the retirement of Wayne Duhlap.




It's not because of the caliber of the food and vegetables. It came because the present-day market has caused the passing of the oldtime grocery store.

The real estate industry responded with a barrage of vituperative letters. Some even suggested that, since real estate advertising contributes so much to this newspaper's revenues, I had no business writing such things.

The public saw it differently. Sales plummeted 50 percent beginning late in 1979. Contractors, tradesmen and real estate sales people got zapped good and hard.

If I were the sort who bore grudges, I would have gloated. Actually, it's no fun to see an entire industry suffer, even if its members were wrong when they kept trumpeting that "Now is the time to buy"

LATELY, HOWEVER, conditions have changed. It now appears that the period from now until mid-1981 will be a good time to buy a single-family detached house.

Here's why:

• "The average gain in home prices this year is only about 5 percent compared to a previous 10 to 20 percent," according to a release from Marlin R. Hemphill, chairman of the Metropolitan Council of Boards of Realtors. The same word comes from John J. Halser, president of the Western Wayne Oakland County Board of Realtors: "For buyers, annual gains in average home prices, which were 10 percent or better in 1977, 1978 and early 1979, have slowed. Thus far this year, they are rising at an annual rate of 4.5 percent."

• "An ample supply of mortgage money is available at rates well below the record highs seen earlier this year, and a good supply of homes is on the market in nearly all southeast Michigan areas through most price ranges," said Hemphill.

Realtors are always saying now is the time to buy. But this time they are close to the truth.

THE FUTURE looks grim after mid-1981. You can perceive this by reading between the lines in the real estate industry's optimistic handouts. Said Hemphill:

"Home prices can be expected to rise at an accelerated rate by mid-1981 with growing competition for existing units

"Funds for mortgage lending are beginning to cost institutions more, which could bring higher rates or reduced availability."

On top of that, Americans will be forming an annual average of 1.6 million new households during the next decades, he said. When you plug that new demand into declining production, it spells trouble.


"Even if production is increased 200,000-300,000 units over projected need of two million a year, it would take three-five years to catch up," Hemphill said. "This is a perfect scenario for a rapid increase in home prices."

WHEN AMERICAN auto companies built too many gas-guzzling dinosaurs, the little Japanese cars captured a quarter of the market.

But there is no subcompact Japanese housing industry to move into the American market. Suburban communities, with their big lot "snob zoning," are making certain the new housing stock will continue to be the big-lot dinosaurs.

Nevertheless, Hemphill predicts developers will offer "smaller units with fewer amenities and greater energy efficiency." For the sake of those new families of the 1980s, I hope he's right.

## Carter's writing: Insecure loner reaches out

The right-ward slant of Jimmy Carter's writing would indicate, of itself, an outgoing-ness that would be directed toward others.

However, the wide spacing between the words tells a story of a deep desire to keep to himself, with the resulting reluctance to "reach" to the "outside" world. This, of course, indicates an inner conflict.

We have here a basic "loner" who lives in an inner world that is occupied only by himself but who, at the same time, feels a need to establish a line of communication with his surrounding environment.

This little-understood inner conflict would, by its very nature, be a source of painful distress. Jimmy Carter is not a truly happy man; he must wage a constant battle to fight off a feeling of insecurity that is a psychological result of a condition of inner conflict.

He wants to be alone," but at the same time he feels the need for the companionship of others.

I HAVE INTENTIONALLY refrained from any discussion of how any part of this analysis would affect Jimmy Carter's functioning as president of the United States. I leave it to the reader to formulate any conclusions on that point.

As in my analysis last month of Ronald Reagan's handwriting, this analysis has been structured only on an examination of the handwriting of Jimmy Carter the man. To the best of my ability, I have avoided any political implications.

If one could penetrate into the deepest recesses of Carter's mind, and if it were possible to isolate his real inner being, it would be found that the essence of his inner self is enclosed within a protective barrier that is self-imposed and within which he feels protected and secure.

The psychological barrier acts as an insulator that renders it impossible to really "get to" this man.

THOUSANDS of people may think they are very close to Carter. But in the final analysis, extremely few — perhaps only two or three — are allowed to penetrate the invisible psychological wall he has built around his inner self.

If and when such admission is allowed, it does not constitute a permanent stay but is instead a relatively temporary relaxing of the otherwise strict, rigid "guarding of the gate."

When Carter's desired result is accomplished, these individuals find they are once again outside the protective psychological fence that surrounds the inner, real Carter. A great deal of his observable functioning is based on what some people call intuition. He has the ability to sense things. There are probably times when he can not explain precisely how or why he arrives at certain conclusions or makes certain decisions. Jimmy Carter Plains, Georgia 31780

certain extent, by an exceedingly sharp and analytical mind. The ability to analyze is there. The results are often derailed by some of the inner conflicts that plague him.

**HE IS BASICALLY** a very kind and considerate person. And yet his writing does not have any indications of true generosity.

This is indicated by the lack of final endings on his words. Note the particularly abrupt stops in the words "great," "campaign" and "need" — indeed, in all his words.

This lack of true generosity is not to be confused with stinginess. Carter is not stingy, but neither is he truly and sincerely generous.

unrecognized fear of being deprived while, at the same time, the kindness is developed through the living of life and learning the lesson of the need for human reciprocity.

This appears to be a possibility that is indicated in Carter's handwriting, and is a possible explanation of the contradictory results that are visible in the behavior.

**IN CONFORMITY** with some facets of this man's character and personality, he is extremely secretive.

The indications of secrecy are so strong in his writing that it would be safe to say that even those closest to him are not aware of many things concerning him.

One of Carter's strong points is the ability to tackle something that has to be done now. He is able to summon every ounce at his command and direct that force toward an immediate task.

THERE ARE people who are happy and content with a behavior pattern that is based only on their own private feeling of self-satisfaction and fulfillment.

Carter is not one of these. He has a deep need to see and hear outside manifestations that convey the message of a task well done or of a project admirably completed. His pride requires that, in some way, the approval be expressed.

The writing tells a story of a pronounced vacillating of goals and purposes. Even a mediocre handwriting analyst would easily spot the indications of lofty, noble aspirations that may be weakened by areas of complete lack of self-confidence.

There are areas where Jimmy Carter wants to fly very high. At the same time, there are others where he lacks the self-confidence to leave the ground.

Though it may appear logical to deduce that kindness is based on generosity, this need not be the case. This constitutes another inner conflict for him.

It is quite possible for a person to have experienced painful deprivation in his early years and later to become kind but not generous. In this case, the lack of generosity could be based on a deep and He will display a driving force that bulldozes its way through obstacles and surmounts what might otherwise be impassable barriers.

There are indications in Carter's writing of a desire for approval. He wants to be admired and wellthought-of by others. Much of his behavior is aimed at eliciting expressions that would incorporate this response.

This preference for immediate security in some areas of his behavior results in an observable irresoluteness that tends to weaken any confidence others may have in him.





## **Resident recalls sinking of the Athenia**

There may be talk about raising the Titanic but no mention has been made of raising the Athenia, a passenger-carrying British merchant ship torpedoed in World War II.

For Jessie Morrison of Sheldon Road in Plymouth, the sinking of the Athenia remains a vivid memory - a nightmare that lasted for days.

Mrs. Morrison and her 11-year-old son, Jack, had been visiting relatives in Scotland during the fateful summer of 1939. Everyone knew war with Germany was imminent and they were hoping to get safely home to Detroit before the conflict began.

They sailed from Greenock, Scotland, Sept. 1 and it was about noon Sunday. Sept. 3, that they received word that Great Britain had declared war on Germany

'We went down for dinner that night with my girl friend and her little boy. There were not many in the dining room because so many of the passengers were seasick. It was about 7:30 when we left the dining room.

"My friend said she was going down to their cabin. I said we would go up on deck for a little while. That was the last I saw of her. She and her son were blown up when the torpedo hit the engine room. Jack and I were thrown across the deck.

SHE SAID SHE saw the U-boat when it surfaced.

"It came up firing at the ship, trying to get the wireless. It killed a lot of the people on deck.

When the first lifeboat was filled with passengers, the ropes broke and spilled the people into the sea. "The ropes were rotten," said Mrs. Morrison. "I suppose they hadn't been used in 20 years.

'My friend said she was going down to her cabin. I said we would go up on deck for a little while. That was the last I saw of her. She and her son were blown up when the torpedo hit the engine room. Jack and I were thrown across the deck.'

They began launching the empty boats and the passengers had to climb down the side of the ship on rope ladd-

"It was scary," said Mrs. Morrison "Jack was little so I put him through a porthole to be helped down to a boat. I was afraid to go down." Finally, the captain told her to "get up there, this is the last boat," and she went down.

SHE WAS IN a motor boat which was distributing passengers to the lifeboats. By that time it was totally dark. "I didn't know where Jack was and

as soon as I got into the lifeboat I called his name and there he was. We were in the same boat."

There followed a horrible night, a day and another night. She recalls, "We thought every wave was our last. The oars were broken and we were up to our waists in water all the time. The older people had no glasses, no teeth, no clothing. At that time the life preservers were all in the cabins, and no one had a life preserver."

Finally, they saw the lights of a Norwegian freighter, which threw out a line. They were hauled aboard, oneby-one, with the line tied around their waists.

She said the lifeboats had separated in the darkness and they didn't know what had become of the others. They were given sheets to wrap around themselves and the freighter took them to Galway, Ireland, the nearest port.

"THE PEOPLE IN Galway were lovely to us. They gave us second-hand clothes, food and a place to stay. Some other people from the Athenia were there. They had been rescued by the City of Flint," the name of another ship.

How did her son react to all this? Mrs. Morrison said his main concern that had gone down with their ship. She added that "all the passengers were Americans and a lot of them were from Detroit. The Germans tried to say that it was a British submarine that had torpedoed us but the truth came out at the Nuremburg trials - it was a U-boat."

They had spent a week in Galway before word came that the United States government was sending a ship to pick them up and take them back to New York.

Greenock. Another lady and I decided to go to Scotland. Many of the people were afraid to cross the Irish Sea because they might get torpedoed again." Back in Scotland, they had another

week's visit with her family before the ship arrived. Her family tried to persuade her to stay there, believing it would be safer than going across the Atlantic

"As it turned out, Greenock was bombed and many homes were destroyed and lives lost. They were after the torpedo factory there," she added

MRS. MORRISON described their rescue ship, the Orizaba, a Caribbean cruise ship:

'We were packed to the rafters. It was an open deck pleasure boat that had never before crossed the Atlantic It was painted red, white and blue with stars and stripes and well lit at night to show it was an American ship. America was not at war.

She said it was a long, slow trip to New York where they were greeted by the Red Cross. They were given tickets to Detroit and \$10 in cash.

Her husband in Detroit had been listening to the news on the radio when he learned of the sinking of the Athenia. was his piano accordion and the toys He thought his son, Jack, was among the missing until he had a letter from his wife in Scotland

## **Detroit bands continue blues legacy**

Ever since the migration of people from the South to work in industrialized Detroit around World War I, Detroit has had a blues tradition.

That tradition has been quiet the last few years, but two area bands are carving out respected names playing the blues.

Working a rich heritage that reaches back to the Mississippi Delta are the Detroit Blues Band and the Progressive Blues Band. They're sometimes confused because of the similarity of names, but each band has a separate sound, albeit a common legacy.

The Detroit Blues Band is a slightly disreputablelooking aggregation of six men who have musical roots that extend back to Chicago and the blues of Little Walter, Muddy Waters, Sonny Boy Williamson, Little Richard and Jimmy Reed.

Together since 1978, the members of the Detroit Blues Band have been playing the blues since the early '60s, when only a few clubs would employ a blues outfit.

"IN THE 1960s when the blues starting appealing to whites," Detroit Blues Band singer and harmonica player Garfield Angove said, "that's when I started going to the Chessmate in Detroit. Then, I moved to Chicago and played with Muddy Waters and Otis Rush.

In addition to Angove, the Detroit Blues Band includes singer and harmonicist Bob "Bert" Rabout, drummer Tom "T-Bone" Walker, electric bass player Don "Mickey" McKenzie, guitar player Emanuel Garza and pianist Brian O'Keefe.

The Detroit Blues Band will play Sept. 26-27 at Alvin's Delicatessen in Detroit and will return to Piper's Alley in Troy in October.

With a drum-heavy insistent beat, wailing harmonicas and the electric bass, the group has the unmistakable frantic sound of the blues that comes from Mississippi by way of Chicago.

"THERE ARE other blues bands in Detroit," Rabout said, "but we are unique with our drive and push; we have more energy

Don "Mickey" McKenzie said: "Our kind of blues makes people want to express themselves. There's

The Detroit Blues Festival runs Friday through Sunday at Hart Plaza on the riverfront in downtown Detroit. The Detroit Blues Band and the Progressive Blues Band are scheduled to appear Saturday.

no way to dance to the blues, but when we play, somehow people dance.'

The Progressive Blues Band plays Monday and Tuesday nights at the Blue Parrot in Southfield and Wednesday nights at the Soup Kitchen in Detroit.

The band continues Sunday nights through Sept 21 at Piper's Alley Troy

When the Progressive Blues Band plays, it's the blues but with a decided jazz feel. Basic instrumentation is similar to other blues bands - mouth organ, bass, electric guitar and drum - but the difference lies in the hands of veteran tenor saxophone player Don "Hank" Hankins.

Hankins has played with Otis Rush, Junior Wells and Howlin Wolf as well as on dozens of blues records. He defines the ultimate character of this blues band with his jazz tenor solos. The walking bass lines of Keith Harber, on acoustic bass, also announce that this is a band with a special affinity to jazz.

DURING A RECENT Monday night set, when the soloists traded bars on Horace Silver-based blues. there was no doubt about where their inspiration was derived.

Nevertheless, the tradition of the blues goes deep in the Progressive Blues Band. Lead rhythm guitar player Lowell Cauffiel and singer and guitar player Willie D. Warren both see to that. Warren, who hails from Arkansas, has played and sung with some of the best of the Chicago bluesmen.

Nominal band leader Martin Gross, the drummer, calls Warren "probably the most well known blues singer in Detroit now. (Continued on Page 10B)

## The good, the bad and the ugly

Plan 9 Productions, adhering to the words of G.K. Chesterton: "If a thing is worth doing, it is worth doing badly," launches "The Best of the New York World's Worst Film Festival" in Ann Arbor this weekend. Even the name of the festival is bad.

According to the four Canadians who comprise Plan 9, the three-day debauchery will be devoted to the all-time best of the all-time worst films.

Ten movies and seven "selected bad shorts" fill the bill from 7:15 p.m. Friday to 9:30 p.m. Sunday (see schedule).

Among the "most curious, offbeat, bent, lunatic, bizarre, grotesque and uniformly misguided" pictures to be shown are: "Plan Nine from Outer Space" (1959), considered by many to be the worst film ever made, and "The Terror in Tiny Town" (1938), starring a covey of little people known as "Jed Buell's midgets." (Who was it once said "There are no small parts, only small actors"?)

The film "Plan Nine," from which the production company takes its name, started out as a picture called "Tomb of the Vampire," and it was to have starred Bela Lugosi. Unfortunately, Lugosi dropped dead (this time for real) at the start of filming, leaving his director with only two minutes of footage

Undaunted, the director employed his wife's chiropractor as a stand-in for



Lugosi and proceeded with the film. Some several days and \$800 later, "Plan Nine from Outer Space" was hatched.

For lines such as "One thing's for - Inspector Clay's dead. Mursure dered. And somebody's responsible!" the film has won the Golden Turkey Award as "Worst Film of All Time."

ONE CRITIC wrote of the midgets' performances in "The Terror of Tiny Town": "Their acting ability is exceeded only by their height." Another called the film, billed as an all-midget musical western, a "miniature romance."

No, "Tiny Town" is not one of the selected short subjects, but it certainly sounds like one of the best of this festival's worst films - especially if you like Shetland ponies.

"Here is a festival that entirely bypasses the overtrodden path to the elusive grail of greatness and plunges headlong into the netherlands beyond

obverse of genius - the truly awful." Truer words wre never spoken.

In that time, however, he made 31 pictures

Most of those films were good, but 'Robin Hood'' certainly is among the very best. Flynn, at 28, was in the rarest of form as the bandit of Sher-• mediocrity, into the illuminating wood Forest And the rest of the cast is perfect: Basil Rathbone as Guy of Gisbourne, Claude Rains as Prince John, Olivia de Haviland as Marian, and Alan Hale as Little John. ## Hewlett calm despite fan wrath


You really have to admire the way Rich Hewlett handled things after Michigan's football win Saturday over Northwestern.

The former Plymouth Salem All-State quarterback was betrayed by his own fans with a loud chorus boos. The fans chanted for senior John Wangler, the passing specialist, after Michigan failed to score in the third quarter.

It was only Hewlett's second start as a collegian. And despite terrible field conditions caused by a morning-long rain, Hewlett was able to hook up with the fleet Anthony Carter for two touchdown passes and lead the Wolverines to a narrow 17-10 victory

It's hard to figure out, but then not so hard, on why the fans were so displeased with Hewlett's performance. He ran his speciality, the option, only three times. 
coming off knee surgery, was the answer
