

Merchants join hands in splinter retail group

In an effort to spur promotions of retail stores, about 40 merchants have formed a business organization which is separate from the Canton Chamber of Commerce.

Organizer Gary Roberts said the new Canton's Merchants Association wants "no animosity" between itself and the Canton chamber.

But Roberts, who owns a vacuum and sewing machine shop on Ford Road, admitted he is dissatisfied with chamber services for retail stores. He is not a member of the Chamber of Commerce.

"The chamber didn't have what I wanted," Roberts said. "I wanted the

chamber to look at more township ordinances that affect retail businesses.

"Our main purpose is to promote retail businesses on a steady basis."

Roberts said the new group will present its complaints on township business regulations to a new task force on businesses. The group, comprised of township, citizen and business representatives, was suggested by Chamber of Commerce president Frank McMurray.

ACCORDING TO ROBERTS, retailers in Canton have been discussing formation of a merchant association for the last five months.

The group was formed about two weeks ago and officers were elected. At 3 p.m. Saturday, members will hold a "champagne ribbon-cutting" at the Cyprus Gardens restaurant to celebrate the start of the organization.

Roberts said the group is planning a variety of promotional activities to coincide with holidays.

Books containing coupons from participating stores will be distributed prior to Halloween. For Thanksgiving, the group plans a turkey-coloring contest for kids, according to Bob Lancaster, owner of the Peacock Room and a member of the new group.

Roberts said some members of the

merchant association also belong to the Chamber of Commerce. But most do not.

Chamber president McMurray expressed hope that the new group will succeed despite his belief that business interests can best be achieved through one central organization, such as the chamber.

He said establishment of a splinter business organization may draw "a Mason-Dixon line" in shopping centers.

McMurray and Roberts agree that many businesses in Canton are hurting financially because of the downturn in the economic climate.

But McMurray takes exception with

Roberts' belief that the chamber has done little to promote and help retail stores. McMurray estimates membership of the five-year-old chamber at about 130 businesses, including about 85 retail stores.

He said the chamber has attempted to involve retail merchants in bulk advertising campaigns and other promotions. The chamber encouraged merchants to hold "midnight madness" and sidewalk sales in conjunction with the Canton Country Festival last August.

"We tried to get them involved, but the response was very limited," said McMurray.

"Gary Roberts thinks this merchant

association is a new idea. For the last two years, the chamber considered a retail branch. We surveyed our members and found there really wasn't that much of a response to a retail association."

ROBERTS COMPLIMENTS the chamber for its involvement in the community. "I don't want any problems with the chamber or to speak badly of them," he said.

"Canton Township needs calmness. The way to get that is not to go around and bad-mouthing people."

Uncertainties in state aid plague school budget

The school district is growing and so is its operating budget.

But there are major shifts within the proposed budget as the burden to finance education here is being placed more and more on local taxpayers and less on the state government.

That's the picture being faced by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education as it prepares to give final approval to an operating budget for fiscal year 1980-81.

The school board plans to adopt a budget on Monday, Oct. 13, after conducting a public hearing which will begin at 7 p.m. that night in the board offices at 454 S. Harvey, city of Plymouth.

THE PROPOSED budget shows an operating fund shortage of \$830,000 as planned expenses exceed expected income by that amount.

The budget anticipates '80-81 expenses to reach a total of \$38.66 million while total revenues are expected to reach only \$37.83 million.

The shortfall will lower the district's fund equity of almost \$2.2 million on June 30 to about \$1.3 million in June 1981.

Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business, says the major uncertainty in the budget at this point is that the Michigan Legislature still hasn't adopted the '80-81 state aid bill.

In fact, added Hoedel, the state aid legislation may not be approved until December or January.

THE REVENUES from the state included in the proposed budget represent the best guess on what will be the final state aid funding formula, explained Hoedel.

That guess, said Hoedel, is that state aid per pupil will be \$294.31 compared to \$429.71 per student for the '79-80 school year.

If the guess is correct, aid per pupil will drop by \$135.40 for a total state aid revenue reduction of almost \$2.2 million — about a 30 percent decrease in state aid from last year.

When all state funding is considered, Plymouth-Canton expects to receive \$2.6 million less income from the state than last year, or a loss of about 35 percent.

Taxing plans provoke worry

Tisch could have devastating effects on township services and Proposal C could become an administrative nightmare.

That is the opinion of Canton officials on two of the three tax plans on the November ballot.

Finance director Mike Gorman says the other proposal, Proposal A, appears the most workable of the three tax proposals from the township's point of view.

All three — the Tisch tax plan (Proposal D), the legislative-executive plan (Proposal C) and the Smith-Bullard plan (Proposal A) — will appear on the Nov. 4 ballot.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education publicly is opposing all three tax proposals.

Gorman says township officials are worried most about Tisch.

THE PLAN proposed by Shiawassee County, Drain Commissioner Robert Tisch would slash taxes by cutting 1978 property assessments in half.

The proposal requires the state of Michigan to reimburse local units of government for revenues lost as a re-

sult of slashed property assessments — the basis of tax computations.

But Gorman says Canton officials are not counting on full reimbursement if Tisch passes, simply because of the enormous costs to the state.

Township administrators have asked all department heads to work out austere budgets on the premise that Tisch will pass.

Gorman figures that the "full brunt" of Tisch would cost Canton about \$1.8 million in lost tax revenues annually. He figures the state would pay back Canton "for something in between" total reimbursement and nothing.

Gorman said the township could make up lost revenues in the general fund by taking steps to eliminate garbage collection (for an annual cost saving of about \$400,000) and by increasing user fees for other township services.

He is most worried about the impact of the Tisch plan on police and fire services.

Property owners currently pay three separate taxes to Canton Township. The 1981 budget draft of \$3.7 million for operations is based on projected tax revenues of \$1 million. The 1981 budget proposals for police and fire are

pegged at \$1.3 million each. According to Gorman, the bulk of revenues from both departments comes from property taxes.

"THERE WOULD HAVE to be layoffs of police and fire personnel unless we got full reimbursement from taxes."

Buy-American theme dominates Carter's stop at Wayne Assembly

Thousands of UAW members cheered President Jimmy Carter Wednesday as he again called on the American population to buy American-made automobiles.

Carter's speech came during a hectic tour of Ford Motor Co.'s Wayne Assembly Plant, where Ford is building its world cars, the Escort and Mercury Lynx. The 30-year-old plant was recently renovated at a cost of \$45 million.

"American auto workers deserve the chance to compete," Carter told employees on his campaign stop there. "I'm urging American buyers to give you that chance."

Carter and officials from Ford and the UAW stressed what the president said was a "new spirit of cooperation."

That cooperation comes at a time when more than 200,000 auto workers in the nation are still unemployed. Late August figures show Michigan's unemployment rate at 12.5 percent.

The Wayne plant employs about 5,000 people, 4,500 of whom are UAW members.

The move to cooperate also follows the Democratic party platform which calls for removal of "unnecessary governmental regulations," labor law reform and protection of workers affected by plant closings.

Adding his voice was Philip Caldwell, Ford board chairman.

"Consultation and cooperation is the American way of life. It's good to get together, but it's better to stay together," he said.

UAW President Douglas Fraser, who is on Chrysler's board of directors, told the Ford employees that American workers "have been maligned lately."

He added that UAW members "can do and will do better... It's not going to be easy. We'll have to work at it."

Fraser also called on UAW workers to re-elect Carter in November.

IN RETURN, Carter promised that the auto industry would have "the capital it needs to re-tool, to compete, and to maintain its rightful share of the American auto market."

Ford employees seemed to like what they heard. Some waved signs

proclaiming that Carter would be re-elected this fall. Others sat on the shoulders of fellow employees to get a better view as UAW representatives presented Carter with a card and cake marking his 56th birthday.

"He's (Carter) beautiful, but I love him anyway," said Betty Gutchie of Belleville. She said she had stayed after her midnight shift to watch for the president.

Hassan Makki of Dearborn thought the president was "all right." Lofting a sign urging people to Buy American, he added that the new cars are "the best. Buy one. I've ordered one myself."

But Frank Washburn of Dearborn Heights was skeptical of Carter's statement that "I'm going to be your president when the first stream of ships starts unloading in Tokyo and Yokohama."

"It's a lot of political rhetoric that I've heard before," said Washburn, adding that he plans to vote for Reagan. "That's a joke — what he said about our making exports to Japan."

FORD WORKERS had just watched as Carter toured their plant

on Michigan Avenue, shouting "hustle" and "mush" to the more than 100 media representatives who thronged to each stop along the way.

Guiding Carter along the tour was plant manager Joe Latini of Northville.

But it was a sign from Joe Barsen, a Canton Township resident who is president of Local 900 at the plant, that greeted Carter on his arrival. Also welcoming Carter were committee men from Local 900 and Vincent Bruno, education director for Region 1A of the UAW.

Joe Roberts, a Livonia resident who is supervisor of salaried personnel, took a group of the media on an early tour of the plant.

But they rejoined Carter as he toured the plant, pausing to shake hands with linemen Oliver Wiley and James Owens of Garden City.

Later Harold Poling of Bloomfield Hills presented Carter with a full-length white coat proclaiming him a quality control inspector.

The tour ended with Carter driving one of Ford's new world cars down the line.

Which tax plan is best?

Each is thousands of words long. Each would make major changes in the Michigan Constitution. Each requires a lot of study.

So the editors of the 12 Observer & Eccentric Newspapers invited proponents of three tax proposals on the Nov. 4 ballot to the company board room for a full morning of talks, questions and answers.

Most voters will say yes to one proposal, no to the other two — or possibly no to all three.

But what will happen if two or more pass? The sections of each plan which aren't in conflict with the others will go into effect. But where two plans change the same section of the constitution, the State Supreme Court will have to make decisions on which will apply.

Proposal C: Major shift to sales tax

The so-called Executive-Legislative Tax Shift Proposal (Proposal C) will give Michigan a more equitable tax system and "not rock the boat too much."

That's the view of Lt. Gov. James Brickley, a spokesman for the bipartisan proposal.

This proposal is being endorsed by a coalition of government, business, agricultural, labor, education and civic leaders, as well as the Republican and Democratic parties, who were concerned about the other tax proposals on the November ballot.

ESSENTIALLY, C will reduce the money collected in local property taxes and increase the sales and use tax rates. Proponents maintain this will result in a reduction in taxes for most Michigan residents.

Brickley argued, "We are not talking about a 'good' tax because there is no such thing. But we are proposing a system that will be more equitable while doing the least amount of damage."

According to Brickley, public opinion surveys indicate the "sales tax is the least objectionable."

"No tax is popular," Brickley told a group of Observer & Eccentric editors. "For years the property tax has been the least favored. But now the income tax is close behind. People see that the income tax is big and the one that brings in the most money to government."

Proposal D: Tisch target is property tax

"A lot of people say I'm overly simplistic, but we're way off the track and we have to get back on the track."

So says Robert E. Tisch, who proposes to cut property taxes statewide by about \$2 billion a year and require any new statewide revenues to be approved by at least 60 percent of the voters.

"We have not gotten anywhere through the legislative process," Tisch told a group of Observer & Eccentric editors and reporters last week.

"No one is asking the people any longer," said the 60-year-old Shiawassee County drain commissioner.

KNOWN AS Proposal D on the Nov. 4 election ballot, the Tisch plan, if approved, would roll back property assessments to 1978 levels, then cut them in half. Property in Michigan is assessed at 60 percent of its true market value. Tisch would reduce that to 25 percent and limit future assessment on property to 2 percent a year.

"In reducing the property tax, we will be benefiting more than two-thirds of the population," Tisch said. "More than two-thirds of all property tax money paid is 'on the property we live on,'" he added.

Likened to Proposition 13, the property tax cut approved by California voters in 1978, Proposal D would be "terribly positive" for luring business to Michigan, Tisch said.

His is the "only one of the three" (major fall tax referendums) that reduces the tax on all property — industrial, commercial, utility, timber-cutting, agricultural and developmental," said Tisch.

In a recent article for Michigan Township News, Tisch said his proposal is "much more than just a tax cut." Michigan's "competitive edge" will be restored, said Tisch, because the amendment "will spur investment in job-creating businesses through reduction in taxation and controls."

ASKED WHAT job creating businesses he was referring to, Tisch said he couldn't answer the question.

"I think we have to make our climate conducive," Tisch critics, a group which encompasses the state and southeast Michigan political establishment, have called the tax cut a variety of adjectives ranging from "irresponsible" to "devastating."

State officials say the proposal will cause them to cut the state general fund budget as much as 50 percent.

Tisch responded by pointing to the effects of California's Proposition 13 as reported by conservative California economist Arthur B. Laffer and the U.S. Comptroller General.

Tisch said:

- Of 1.4 million state jobs in California, 17,000 were lost due to Proposition 13.
- Some 1.1 million "new private sector jobs" were created. He said two-thirds of the property tax break in California went to business, but that wouldn't happen in Michigan.

California had a \$5 billion to \$6 billion budget surplus when Proposition 13 passed, Tisch conceded, but added, "fewer than half of the local governments even asked for assistance."

Tisch critics, such as Rep. Perry Bullard (see above story), say the California-Michigan comparison is faulty, citing the western state's graduated income tax and still growing population.

IF MICHIGAN'S economy fails to recover from its current slump by the time the tax cut would take effect in 1982, there are options, Tisch said.

The governor "can declare an emergency or catastrophe," he said, "and I guess all he has to do is say 'Tisch.'"

Other aspects of Proposal D include:

- Required state reimbursement of local governments lost tax revenue.
- Persons over age 62 would be exempt from local school district operating taxes (but not bond taxes) on their principal homesteads.
- A homeowner earning between \$5,000 and \$10,500 a year would have his assessment lowered 75 percent, rather than 50 percent; homeowners earning less than \$5,000 annually would pay no property taxes.
- Funding for K-12 school districts can't be reduced below the 1980-81 school aid formula unless 80 percent of the members of the legislature vote to do so.

Tisch has said this fall's second tax cut try would be his last. In 1978, state voters rejected the first Tisch plan, 63-37 percent, in favor of a milder tax limitation proposal pushed by Farmington Hills insurance executive Richard Headlee.

But it's unlikely Tisch will stop railing against state legislators, whom he prefers to call "politicians."

"I think we need a whole new legislature with maybe a handful of exceptions," he said.

the job they're paid for."

OTHER PROVISIONS of Proposal C are:

- Sales tax on residential consumers of energy products would be phased out by Jan. 1, 1985. This would apply to natural gas, fuel oil and electricity.
- Assessment of agricultural and forestry property on the basis of use value instead of market value would be permitted. The purpose is to keep farm taxes from rising on the basis of developers speculation.
- Some adjustments to the 1978 tax limitation amendment (Headlee) would be made relating to the computation of state spending requirements and the fixed portion of revenues which are returned to local government.

BULLARD SAID not only would Proposal A eliminate school operating property taxes on homes and owner-occupied farms, but it would equalize the disparities between school districts with "rich" property tax bases and those with "poor" bases.

He cited the case of Bridgman School District in the southwest corner of Michigan which has nearly \$3,000 of income per student (nearly double the state average) and only a six mill (\$6 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation) school operating levy. The reason: Bridgman has a nuclear power plant and only 1,000 pupils in school.

Proposal A: Aims to aid K-12 schools

State Reps. Roy Smith and Perry Bullard have a plan which eliminates virtually all school property taxes for homeowners, provides for a new state business property tax for education, and maintains local control for schools.

The plan is Proposal A on the Nov. 4 ballot — one of three tax issues Michigan voters will decide.

Proposal A is commonly known as the "Smith-Bullard plan" for the legislators who drafted it.

Bullard, D-Ann Arbor, talked to the Observer & Eccentric editorial board last week to explain the proposal and tell of its benefits. (The other half of the team is Rep. Roy Smith, R-Saline.)

Bullard said Proposal A gives more local property tax relief than Proposals C and D, also on the ballot next month.

He said the other proposals promise more than they can deliver — "like the Headlee (tax limitation) amendment" approved by voters two years ago.

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Bullard said educational opportunities shouldn't be based on the location

of industries or businesses.

The Smith-Bullard plan would provide for a maximum 30.5 mill levy on commercial, industrial and office businesses. Local voters could still provide "enrichment" funds for schools by approving a maximum seven mill levy or a one percent income tax.

THE ADVANTAGE of Proposal A is that the statewide business property tax would benefit all schools in the state, Bullard said.

The four-term legislator insisted Proposal A "isn't a reaction to the Tisch plan," which would lower property assessments to the 1978 level and then cut them in half.

Bullard said state property tax plans for education have been discussed and voted down during the past 10 years. Those plans, however, lacked features of the Smith-Bullard proposal, he said.

Bullard said Proposal C (developed by Gov. William Milliken and legislative leaders) is really a "defense plan" against the Tisch plan (Proposal D).

BULLARD SAID Proposal A gives more state funds to school districts with a low spending per pupil because of a "poor" property tax base.

The legislator said Proposal A has been endorsed by the Michigan Education Association, the largest teachers' union in the state; the Michigan League of Women Voters, and the Michigan Townships Association.

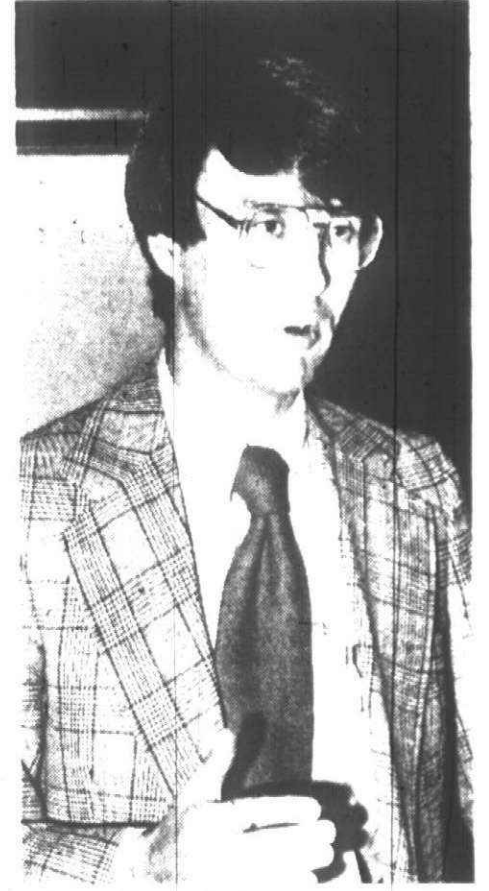
Under questioning, Bullard and Daniel Sharp, Proposal A campaign manager, defended their plan against opposition from the Michigan Association of School Boards and Michigan Association of School Administrators.

"SUPERINTENDENTS (in high-income school districts) have good salaries, free cars and perks. They're doing fine, and they don't want to risk shifting the battleground from local millage campaigns to the legislature," Bullard said.

Although Proposal A would shift financing for schools from the local districts to the state, it would guarantee strong local control. Bullard said it stipulates that local school boards would continue to control programs and personnel.

In answer to the criticism that Proposal A was a windfall for farmers because it would exempt their barns and cropland as well as their houses, Bullard said it would help preserve family farms and cropland. The exemption would not apply to corporate farms, he added.

SHARP CRITICIZED the conclusions made by suburban school administrators who say that the Smith-Bullard plan would result in less funds for their school districts.

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Tisch would cut revenue, says SC president

To hear President C. Nelson Grote describe it, voter approval of the Tisch property tax cut would be as welcome at Schoolcraft College as another faculty strike.

"It certainly has the potential of putting a tremendous limitation on us," Grote said in a recent interview.

If Tisch (Proposal D on the Nov. 4 ballot) passes, it wouldn't take effect until 1982, giving the Michigan Legislature a year to determine state reimbursements for local property tax losses.

The Tisch plan would roll back property assessments in Michigan to 1978 levels, then cut them in half. Those who are 62 and older would pay no school property taxes on their principal living place. Future assessment increases on residential and agricultural land would be limited to 2 percent a year.

PROPERTY TAXES account for 38.5 percent of Schoolcraft's 1980-81 budget. The \$14 million budget, which took effect July 1, includes operating and debt retirement costs.

According to Schoolcraft officials,

local and state revenue for 1981-82 would be an estimated \$10.4 million without Tisch and \$8.2 million with it. The projected \$2.2 million loss represents about a 21 percent cut.

Local taxes and state aid combined are 75 percent of the two-year college's budget. Under Tisch, college officials project a \$1.3 million reduction in local tax revenue, even after the required state matching reimbursement, and a \$950,000 cut in state aid.

A \$2.2 million cut would lead to reductions in credit hours, programs and services, Grote said. State aid formulas for community colleges are based on the number of credit hours taught.

While Tisch backers say their proposal requires the state to reimburse local governments for property tax losses, Grote isn't buying it.

"THERE'S NO way the state can reimburse the property tax loss 100 percent," he said.

Proposal D, says Grote, would require a majority vote of district voters for Schoolcraft to raise tuition and fees.

"What it really means is we've effectively frozen tuition and fees," said

Grote.

The college increased tuition this fall \$1.50 to \$18.50 per credit hour.

Grote was asked about skyrocketing property assessments in the Schoolcraft district, which includes the Livonia, Plymouth-Canton, Garden City, Clarenceville and Northville school districts.

"The electorate already has reasonable protection," he said, citing the Headlee tax limitation amendment passed two years ago.

"We were not able to take advantage of all the (property value) growth that was there because of the Headlee rollback," he said.

The college's millage rate for next year was reduced from \$2.06 per \$1,000 of assessed property value to \$1.93, but inflation-fueled assessment increases will likely make the tax bills higher.

GROTE SAID state funding for community colleges could also decrease under the Smith-Bullard (Proposal A) plan. The plan proposes shifting funding of K-12 education from local property taxes to the state income tax. A 1.2 percent increase in the income tax is possible.

Smith-Bullard's strongest backing comes from the Michigan Education Association.

It proposes a fixed one mill for operating for community college districts with a maximum of 2.5, if voters approve. Schoolcraft's voted operating millage is now 1.77 mills.

Grote said the biggest drawback to Smith-Bullard is a lack of implementing legislation, leaving millage limits and state aid formulas up to the Legislature.

"Different legislators are going to be pushed and pulled by different constituencies," Grote said.

A COMBINED property assessment cut and 1.5 percent state sales tax increase proposed by the governor-legislative coalition (Proposal C) has the "least negative impact on Schoolcraft," Grote said. If Proposal C passes, college officials expect no property tax revenue loss in 1981-82.

Future effects on state aid or local tax revenues "will basically average out," Grote said.

The plan proposes to exempt the first \$7,100 from residential and farm assessments. The exemption would rise by a fixed percentage in later years.

Grote had recommended the college Board of Trustees support the coalition plan "with reservation," but the board opted to oppose all three proposals.

The Michigan Community College Association supports Proposal C.

GROTE SAID the Tisch referendum is due to "dissatisfaction with the legislative process which they are trying to bypass."

"I don't believe the average voter is in a position to understand these proposals," he said.

"As an administrator that relates regularly to the legislative process,

taxation and millage questions, I find them complicated and complex," he said.

Grote said his property taxes have "almost doubled" in 10 years.

But he adds: "I'm satisfied that we get good value out of our tax dollar. I'm not one that believes there is a lot of fat in our school system."

Tax proposals in a nutshell

Voters Nov. 4 will decide on three state ballot proposals affecting taxes — A, C and D.

PROPOSAL A "Smith-Bullard" calls for cutting property taxes (residential and agricultural) for schools. Requires state to make up the loss to school districts. State income tax would have to be raised to 6 percent or more from current 4.6 percent to fund school systems. To be phased in over five-year period under a complicated formula.

EFFECTS: A shift from property to income tax, more uniform financing of school districts. Local districts could vote "enrichment" property taxes.

PROPOSAL C "Coalition Plan" advanced by Gov. Milliken and bipartisan leaders in the legislature: Would cut property taxes by exempting first \$7,100 of residential property assess-

ment. Loss to be made up by increasing state sales tax to 5.5 percent from 4 percent.

EFFECT: Mostly a shift from property to sales tax; probably a small tax savings as time goes on because of phase-out of sales tax on utility bills.

PROPOSAL D "Tisch" would roll back property assessments to 1978 level and then cut in half, resulting in 60 percent cut in property taxes. Would then require state to pay local governments for some of the lost revenue. Any new state taxes would require approval of 60 percent of voters.

EFFECT: A tax cut and cutbacks (uncertain as to severity) in state services and facilities. Would affect colleges, local school districts, state police, state hospitals, state parks, revenue sharing with local governments.

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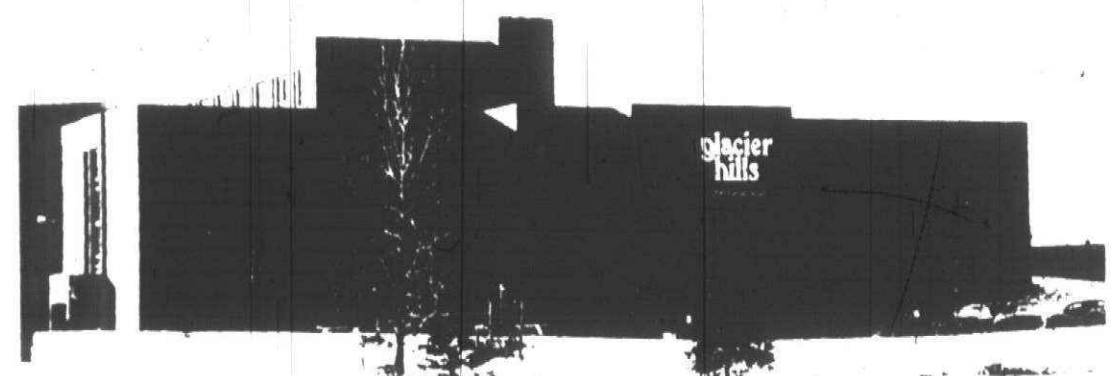

the state," said the finance director.
"Self-generated revenue, such as the sale of accident reports, is minimal. Upping those fees certainly wouldn't pay for the police department."

Gorman said the Township Board may consider a residential-user charge for fire-department ambulance services if Tisch should pass.

Other possible alternatives include elimination of ambulance services altogether. Gorman said several communities in Michigan are considering establishment of public-safety departments as a relatively inexpensive means of providing police and fire protection.

Under that plan, certified police officers also would fight fires.

"If you get your revenues down substantially, you may have to go to a public-safety department," said Gorman.

The bulk of lost tax monies in the general fund could be made up by eliminating township-paid garbage collection, Gorman said. Residents, like their neighbors in Plymouth Township, would have to contract individually with garbage collection companies.

Gorman said fees for services of the recreation, building and planning departments probably would be hiked substantially.

He tempered his remarks about the impact of Tisch by observing that no one really knows how the plan would be implemented.

"I think Tisch will affect the people on the higher levels of government more than those on the local level," said Gorman.

"It's not supposed to affect Canton directly, because the state is supposed to make up the lost revenues. If the law says they must and they can't, I don't know what would happen."

Gorman said state officials still are debating a provision of the 1978

Headlee Amendment, which requires the state to reimburse local municipalities for services required by new state laws. Gorman said local units of government have not received any reimbursements under that Headlee provision.

GORMAN SAID township officials know more about Proposal C, because laws to implement the plan already have been passed by the Michigan Legislature.

The plan, which was drawn up by a coalition of leaders in government, business, agriculture and other areas, exempts property owners from paying taxes on the first \$7,100 of the home's state-equalized value (SEV). The proposal earmarks a 1.5 percent hike in the state sales tax for reimbursement to local government.

Gorman said he believes the proposal, commonly known as the legislative-executive plan, would leave township revenues intact.

"The only thing it would really do, in my opinion, is make a lot of work for us," he maintains.

Legislation already signed by Gov. Milliken would require property owners to sign written affidavits in township and city halls regarding their residency, home ownership and age.

Local governments would be responsible for processing the forms in order to qualify homeowners for the \$7,100 exemption. Homeowners would have until Nov. 1 to file the forms for tax bills which are typically mailed Dec. 1.

Gorman said the township usually forwards tax information to Wayne County during November.

"That means, technically, that 14,000 homeowners could come in here Oct. 30 to fill out those forms," he said. "That procedure seems not to be workable at all."

"It's our feeling that if Proposal C passes, we'd have to start pushing this thing in February or March."

Canton's treasury department already has mailed requests for updated tax information in the event that Proposal C is approved.

GORMAN SAID Proposal A "seems the most workable as far as local units of government are concerned."

The Smith-Bullard plan would roll back the current five-mill limit which charter townships may levy without a

public vote to two mills. The limit would apply only to general operating taxes. The plan allows voters to approve additional millages at the polls.

The state would reimburse local units of government for lost revenue through an increase in the state income tax.

Gorman said the Michigan Township Association has endorsed Proposal A as the least detrimental of the three tax plans on the November ballot.

Township officials will not make a formal recommendation on any of the tax proposals, Gorman said.

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Population boom spurs postal shift

A five-year-old plan to relieve overcrowded conditions in the Plymouth post office is close to being implemented.

The overcrowding has resulted largely from the population boom in Canton and a corresponding rise of mail to that community, according to Plymouth Postmaster John Mulligan.

The "backbone" of the plan calls for the transfer of Canton mail responsibilities from Plymouth to the Westland post office, said Dennis Nott, director of customer services for the Detroit district.

The plan first was proposed about 1975.

Nott said the postal service also is studying the possibility of locating a post office in Canton. However, no firm proposals have been made.

"We're looking at what the demand is out there and whether a post office would be justified," said Nott.

He declined to specify details of the plan to transfer Canton mail responsibilities to the Westland office on Wayne Road, north of Ford, pending notification to a variety of postal unions.

ates five homes for the mentally retarded and three for delinquents.
Michigan Human Services also has consulted with the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
James Dixon of the Detroit FBI office said it hasn't been determined if there has been a violation of federal law. He speculated that if there has been, it probably would come under the 1964 Civil Rights Acts.

"That's my opinion," said Dixon. "The gist of the thing is that the kids aren't there now. It could be just a foolish prank."
A .22 caliber bullet recovered from the house would be turned over to the Michigan State Police post at Northville for analysis, Stewart said. The shots had been fired Sunday night "from what appears to be a moving vehicle," Stewart said.
Two bullets entered the front porch

window and became lodged in walls. The pathway of the bullets indicated the vehicle probably had been traveling west on Maben, he said.
So far, information is skimpy.
The shooting was discovered Monday by construction workers who showed up to do chores. Officers hadn't had a chance to check neighbors to see if they heard or saw anything, he said.
A caretaker who had been staying at the house had been absent at the time

of the shooting.
"At this point, we have very little to go on. We haven't received any voluntary information from the public."
Stewart had recommended that a guard or caretaker stay at the house after a similar shooting occurred during the night or early morning of Sept. 9-10.
That blast by a shotgun put holes in the garage door and front of the house.

Also damaged was a tractor parked in the driveway.
NO ONE was injured in that incident. James Minder, executive director of Michigan Human Services, said he thought that shooting was "just a bunch of kids fooling around."
But Stewart says he "can't remember a home (under construction) that was shot."
Builders Barry Stone and Edwin Murphey, of Murphey-Stone Custom Builders in Ann Arbor, say this is the first time anyone has fired shots at homes they have built.

There have been minor acts of vandalism normally associated with an empty house under construction, Stone said.
Group homes are being set up by the state to move retarded persons from institutions to smaller, community-based facilities.
Residents receive round-the-clock supervision. They also receive training in self-care, attend special education classes or are employed in sheltered workshops.
State law permits such homes in residential areas. Similar group homes must be at least 1,500 feet apart.

Pupil busing now is quiet issue

It was nine years ago this week that one of the most controversial topics in the suburbs — school busing — first erupted.
Like the ash from Mount St. Helena, the fallout was widespread.
It is quiet now, but reflections on the ninth anniversary show that while some things have quieted down, other aspects of the issue may erupt again.
It was just nine years when U.S. District Judge Stephen Roth found the state of Michigan and the Detroit Public Schools guilty of racial discrimination in educational decisions and policies.
Roth said that a remedy for eliminating the past discrimination could include the busing of students between Detroit and 54 suburban districts. He put that position in writing in mid-June, 1972. That ruling was overturned by the U.S. Supreme Court in a 5-4 decision in late July, 1974.
The federal court in Detroit then ordered into effect a limited busing plan which involved only Detroit.
The case isn't dead yet although there there is no direct impact on the suburbs now.

ROTH DIED several years ago and Judge Robert DeMascio took over the case. Under pressure, he agreed earlier this year to have another judge handle the case. The case is now in the hands of a three-judge panel.
But the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, which

initiated the civil suit in 1970, said that its plans include a metropolitan busing plan involving Detroit and its suburbs.
The NAACP is continuing its legal argument that the state of Michigan is ultimately responsible for all public education and can't delegate its authority to local school districts. Jesse Goodwin, education committee chairman for the NAACP, told The Observer.
He said there is no active motion before the federal court in the Detroit busing case to bring the suburbs into the case, "we hope to get into that very shortly."

THE ISSUE, though quiet now, was the most frequently discussed topic — if not the only topic, heard among suburban residents.
Suburban homes sprouted window signs with the message "This Family Will Not Be Bused."
One state legislative candidate was giving away the signs. His opponent was charging 50 cents each for them.
Homeowners started anti-busing chapters in their backyards or family rooms. There were large groups of parents jamming public meetings to demand that school officials promise to vehemently oppose any busing order from a federal judge.
City Councils got into the act, adopting anti-busing resolutions and some even promising to go to jail if found guilty of failing to obey a court order on busing.

THERE WAS AN immediate political impact caused by the busing feud.

Candidates for every office — as remote from busing as the office of Oakland County Drain Commissioner — said they were not only anti-busing but more anti-busing than their opponents.
Challengers with no political background challenged long-time incumbents on the busing issue.
In Oakland County, L. Brooks Patterson gained exposure in the newspapers and on local TV news programs by

being Irene McCabe's attorney. Ms. McCabe gained nationwide prominence as leader of a citizens group opposed to busing. Patterson was elected Oakland County Prosecutor on the basis of the publicity.
Conservative candidates running on anti-busing platforms either won election or came close to defeating well-known incumbents.

When two candidates for a post were both vigorously anti-busing, the voters made their decision on "who was the MOST anti-busing."

BUT JUDGE ROTH, who died several years ago, commented in his 1972 ruling about the reality of busing — within a single district.

He cited national and state statistics which show that a large number of pupils already get to school on a bus.

In Michigan, from 35 to 40 percent of all students are bussed, he said.

The only change under his metropolitan plan is the "direction of the bus."

"For school authorities or private citizens to now object to such transportation practices raises the inference not of hostility to pupil transportation but rather racially motivated hostility to the desegregated school at the end of the ride," Roth said.

The judge based his ruling on numerous actions of the Detroit school board, state Legislature, and past policies of the Federal Housing Administration which led to racially segregated housing patterns in Detroit and the suburbs.

The state Constitution gives general control over public education to the state government.

But during the 1971 crisis and in subsequent years, suburban school officials claimed that the local school district boundaries were sacred and couldn't be arbitrarily changed.

IN RECENT years, however, the problems of money and vacant schools

caused by declining student enrollments caused some changes in the suburbs.

One suburban school board attorney warned that vacant public schools, property or equipment shouldn't be sold, rented, or leased to church schools.

The reason for that advice was a New Orleans busing case in which a federal judge ruled that suburban schools may be aiding "the white flight" from the central city if they cooperate in allowing private or parochial schools to be located in their communities.

But some Detroit area suburbs have not followed that advice.

Detroit Catholic Central High School moved in 1979 from the northwest side of Detroit into a Redford Township junior high school.

United Christian Schools bought a vacant school in Garden City.

On a larger scale, there were other actions that show a growing scale of cooperation of public schools without regard to local boundaries.

PLYMOUTH—CANTON schools, faced with a growing pupil enrollment, have agreed to rent a Livonia School District junior high next fall to handle its overflow.

Livonia Board of Education has agreed to handle the administration of the North Dearborn Heights food and busing programs.

In adult education, Livonia will handle the Redford Union programs while

Garden City will do the same for the Crestwood and North Dearborn Heights districts.

School officials defend all those actions by saying that they were mutually agreed to under contract.

Dr. Goodwin of the NAACP said his group is aware of the rise of church schools in formerly public schools and it further proves the point that the state government is part of the educational decision making process.

Attorney William Saxton, who represents most the suburban school districts in the Detroit busing case, doesn't feel that parochial schools locating in vacant public schools would have any impact on his clients' legal position.

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Budget adoption looms

The expected loss of 35 percent in state income compares to an expected gain of almost \$5.7 million, or 24 percent, in local property tax income.

One of the major points of the budget is that expenses will increase by 11.7 percent while income will rise by only 6 percent, Hoedel pointed out.

WHILE THE BUDGET is tight for the coming year, the situation could have been worse, Hoedel said.

Last June residents voted permission for the school district to levy the fully authorized amount of 35.26 mills for operations. If that ballot issue had failed, the district would have had to roll back the levy by 1.26 mills or by almost \$1.1 million.

The administration has still reduced the budget by almost \$1.3 million from where it started in early summer with the first draft budget as represented by the Wayne County Allocation Budget.

If the full levy had not been authorized by voters, the reductions would have totalled almost \$2.5 million.

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OTHER HIGHLIGHTS in the proposed budget include:

- Enrollment is projected at 17,200 students, an increase of 328 students, or 1.9 percent, over last year. This is the lowest increase in raw numbers of students for 10 years and is the lowest percentage increase in enrollment for more than two decades.

- The budget includes funds to hire 13.7 additional regular classroom teachers plus 7.1 additional special education teachers.

- The district's total taxbase (SEV) will be about \$835 million, which is \$164 million, or 24 percent, higher than last year.

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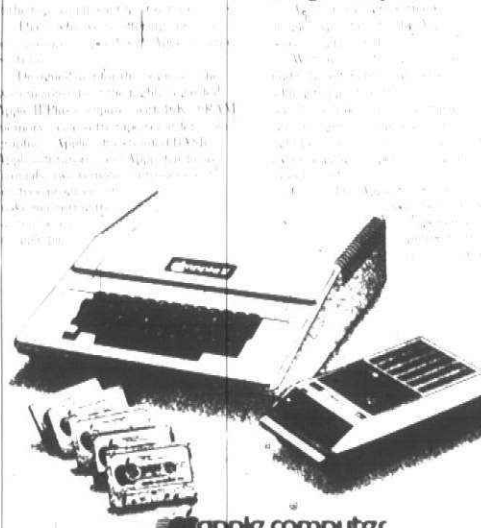
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Execution & effect keys to marching band success

This is the third of a four-part series explaining the components of a high school marching band competition. Musical effect and musical execution are the elements of competition being explained this week.

By BETTY DeLANO

Without fight songs and marching bands, a football halftime would be pretty boring. And without music and drill, a high school marching band competition would be nonexistent.

For members of the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) Marching Band, the music heard by fans each week at either Plymouth Salem or Plymouth Canton home football games is vital when performed in competitions throughout the state on the weekends.

These musical selections that are heard each week in the CEP stadium include "Carmina Burana" and "West Side Story," arranged by Joseph Laird, and "Buckaroo Holiday," arranged by Ralph Johnson.

The music performed in competition is the basis for two major areas of evaluation by a team of judges that in-

cludes musical effect and musical execution.

Both of these categories hold a point value of 20 points that contributes to the possible 100-point total.

Under the caption of musical effect, judges are to evaluate all those elements of a band's performance which collectively make the finest, smoothest, most pleasing and finished program.

A band's superior ability, originality and showmanship also are considered by the adjudicators. Audience reaction also is considered if the judge believes

it is genuinely prompted by the band's performance.

Musical performance by the band is the emphasis by the judge assigned to the musical execution category. The judging of musical execution involves consideration of rhythmic accuracy, tone and intonation, uniformity of style and expression, and musical content (difficulty).

This caption emphasizes how the music is performed rather than what is performed.

The music performed by the band has been worked on since before the

start of school. While at band camp one week prior to the start of school, a number of band graduates have assisted the current band members in learning the music.

Section leaders, as they are called, included Mary Klean (flutes and clarinets), Mark Thrasher (saxophones), Steve Hawkins (trumpets), Lew Burton (horns), Bob Humphries (low brass), Dave Gerke (tubas), Bill Sweeney (percussion) and Meg Johnson (color guard).

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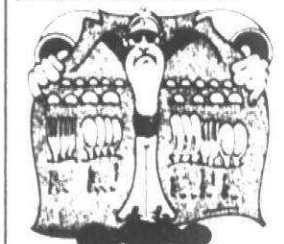

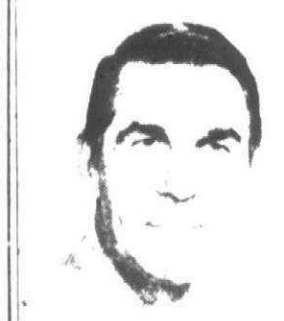

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Lawmakers charge suburbs over-charged on water

Are suburban water users subsidizing cheaper water for Detroit residents?

Two suburban state legislators this week made that charge during a special hearing in Livonia on new water rate hikes proposed by the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD).

The planned Dec. 1 rate increases, approved by the Detroit City Council in August, range from less than 10 percent to more than 100 percent for suburban wholesale customers. The systemwide average is 43 percent. Detroit's increase is 15 percent.

State Reps. John Bennett, D-Red-

ford, and Jack Kirksey, R-Livonia, told DWSD director Charles Beckham that the proposed Detroit water rate of \$2.75 per 1,000 cubic feet of water should be \$3.07, which Beckham said is the actual cost of providing the water to Detroit residents.

"SOMEBODY IS picking up part of the actual cost of service to residents of Detroit," said Kirksey.

Bennett, chairman of a special eight-member legislative committee investigating the water rate hikes, said suburban customers were subsidizing Detroit users. DWSD has 97 community water and sewer customers.

Beckham and a representative of

Camp Dresser & McKee, DWSD's rate consultant, cited a 1917 state law and DWSD's "revenue requirements" as the reasons for the Detroit discrepancy.

The law, which Bennett said should be repealed, permits the Detroit-run water utility to charge suburban wholesale customers within 10 miles of its borders at least the same rate Detroit pays but no more than double that rate.

Some suburban communities within 10 miles of Detroit borders, said Les Curtis of Camp Dresser & McKee, would also be charged a wholesale rate less than actual cost. Those communities include Canton, Bloomfield and West Bloomfield townships and the city of Farmington Hills.

CURTIS SAID using a Detroit base of \$3.07 (or a \$6.14 maximum for nearby suburban customers based on the state law) would have led to \$2.3 million more than needed in suburban revenues.

Using a Detroit base of \$2.75 — and a \$5.50 maximum for some near suburban cities — means the suburban revenue requirement wouldn't be exceeded, Curtis said.

DWSD's revenue requirements for fiscal 1981, according to Curtis, are \$31.9 million from the suburbs and \$33.5 million from Detroit.

"Whether Detroit is at \$2.75, \$3.07, \$1 or \$15, the revenue requirement from the suburbs is still the same,"

said Curtis. "It's not affected by the Detroit rate."

"WE WANT the City of Detroit customers to pay their share," said Bennett.

"They are," Beckham responded.

The water utility's revenue requirements include a 10 to 11 percent rate of return, Beckham said.

"All the money goes back into the system," he said. "Money from suburban communities goes back to the suburban side of the books." He said "there is no subsidy to the (city) general fund."

But Kirksey insisted there was a subsidy if Detroit users were paying less than cost.

"When you buy a car, is the profit you pay to General Motors a subsidy of General Motors?" Beckham asked Kirksey. "It benefits the owner of the system."

"No," said Kirksey. "you're benefiting the residents of the City of Detroit, and they don't own the system."

Beckham said "seven or eight" lawsuits had upheld Detroit's ownership of the system.

"If you want to make a challenge," he told Kirksey, "don't make an emotional challenge, make a legal challenge."

ONLY FIVE suburban residents testified at the hearing held Monday morning in Livonia City Hall.

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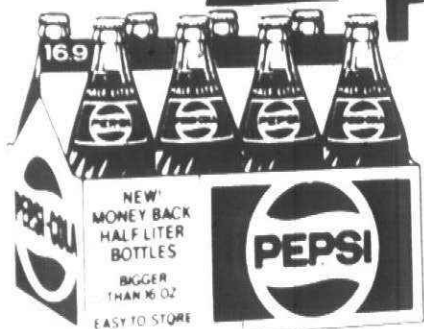
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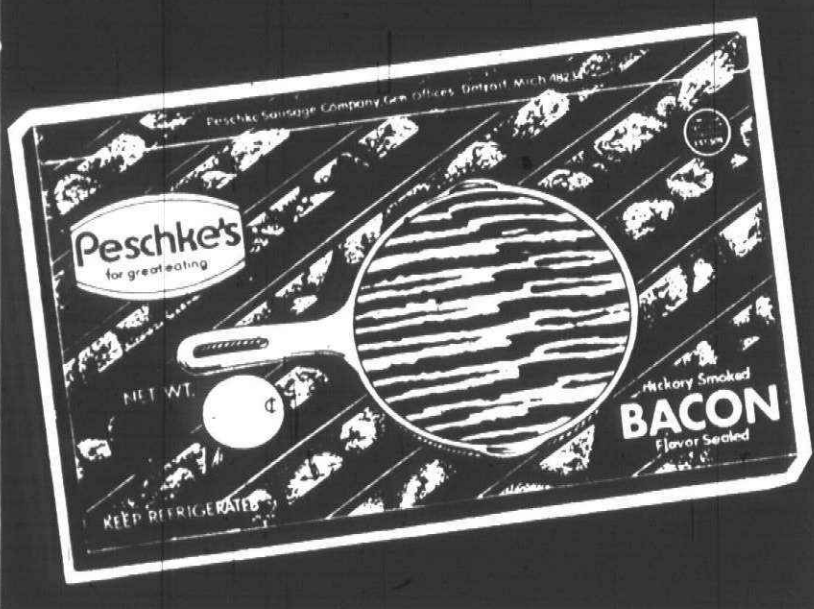

Skimpy preparation bogs board meetings

A heavy cloud of cigarette smoke hangs in the air. People wander in and out of the room and sip at bottles of soft drinks. Others fidget or stare into space as the hands of the clock move forward, with little getting done.

THIS SCENE is common at Tuesday evening meetings of Canton's township board.

Indeed, people who have business with the board might be tempted to pack a thermos of black coffee, or perhaps a bedroll to curl up on as they wait their turn.

Board members must tackle important issues such as property zoning, taxes and budgets and services to residents. Obviously, these decisions should be given careful consideration.

But all too often meetings become bogged down because trustees and the department heads who supply information are unprepared.

SOMETIMES the board members can't act because they lack enough information. Other times they carry on discussions much too long.

That means delays in getting through an agenda and, ultimately, in implementing plans. It also means inconvenience for persons who have to wait their turn for the board's collective ear.

Last week's meeting offers a good example. The township board debated the rezoning of a three-acre land parcel for more than an hour, then spent another half-hour deciding how the motion should be worded.

During the lengthy discussion, information and comments were supplied by township planners, members of the planning commission and the township board.

Obviously, the board got carried away on this agenda item. Time was poorly spent.

LATER, the board decided to suspend its own rules in order to deal with several other items still on the agenda. The meeting — which started at 7 p.m. — finally ended about 12:45 a.m.

Marathon board meetings are fairly common in Canton Township, despite a board rule to cut off meetings at 11 p.m. Under a second rule, board members may vote to extend the meeting to 11:30 p.m. or resolve to suspend the rules altogether.

Canton officials need to put more oil on the wheels of government. One way would be to sched-

ule separate study sessions so trustees can sit down with administrators or other interested persons to gain information before the item comes up for vote.

STUDY sessions, which are open to the public, are routinely held in communities such as Plymouth, Livonia and Westland. Officials can take as much time as they need to research an issue without holding up other business.

One hallmark of leadership is to be prepared. Another is to manage time in a reasonably efficient manner.

Most of Canton's officials — elected and appointed — take their responsibilities seriously. But they need to work harder to put their good intentions into action.

"Although the precedent is leading by one million votes," Truman imitated the then-familiar clipped Kaltenborn tones.

The public loved it.

Then there was Franklin Roosevelt in a pseudo-serious tone telling how he didn't mind being publicly criticized, nor did his wife or son, but Fallah, his dog, didn't like it at all.

An ominous sign of things to come happened a few years after Roosevelt's quip when a young U.S. senator from California, Richard Nixon, used his dog Checkers to save his political career.

With a perfectly straight face, Nixon told the country that it was unjust to criticize his dog. He sold it, the American public bought it.

FDR, TRUMAN and Kennedy led the nation during threatening times. But they did it with grace and humor.

English statesmen Joseph Addison said it best: "Mirth is like a flash of lightning, that breaks through gloom of clouds, and glitters for a moment; cheerfulness keeps up a kind of daylight in the mind, and fills it with a steady and perpetual serenity."

Someday, hopefully, this country will regain its sense of humor and then we will regain our serenity.



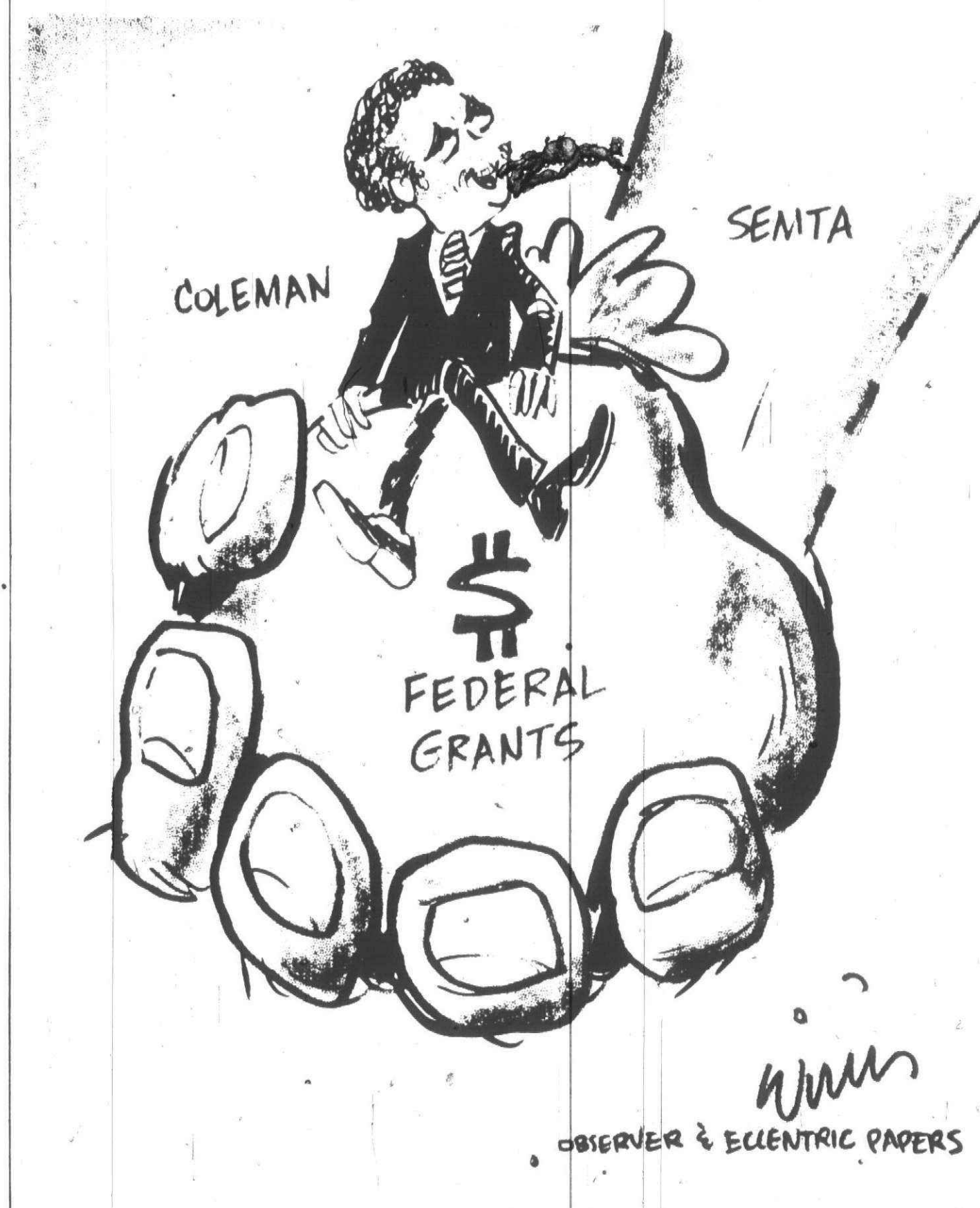

U.S. almost sent millions to wrong guy

Coleman Young climbed out of bed in Manoogian mansion a week ago Monday and for breakfast had ham, eggs, grits, orange juice, coffee and 18 stupid pills.

In Washington the same morning, Theodore Lutz had tomato juice, waffles, sausage, coffee and 18 stupid pills.

Actually, I don't know whether the mayor of Detroit and the administrator of the federal Urban Mass Transit Administration had tomato juice, orange juice, ham, sausage, eggs, grits, waffles and coffee for breakfast.

But by 2 p.m., it was pretty apparent they had consumed 36 stupid pills between them.

THAT WAS WHEN they announced, in the mayor's office, that the federal government was coming through with \$22 million.

The money, however, wasn't going to the city of Detroit, of which Young is chief executive. No official of the city of Detroit will touch a penny of it.

In fact, the ceremony should have been held a few blocks north, in the headquarters of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority, SEMTA is the agency which is getting the \$22 million, including \$5 million for preliminary engineering on a subway surface light rail rapid transit line.

Now, SEMTA is a state-created agency whose governing board and employees come from seven counties. The city of Detroit is a minority member of SEMTA, with only one-fourth of the SEMTA region's population.

ONE COULD HAVE been misled by the TV and some of the newspaper coverage. Said the Detroit Free Press, in a gargantuan display of civic ignorance:

"The city of Detroit Monday was formally awarded a \$5 million federal grant to begin work. . . . Ted Lutz announced the subway grant award during a visit to Detroit. . . . He said his action Monday formally awarded the grant to the city."

Now, no one doubts Young would like to see one-fourth of the federal budget, two-thirds of the state budget and all the local tax money south of the Mackinac Bridge go into the Detroit city treasury, to be administered by his appointees.

Fortunately for all of us, that isn't the case. This batch of bucks went to SEMTA.

WHAT MADE Young's and Lutz's act so baldly stupid is that Young is a rather unpopular guy in the suburbs. That's one reason we have a SEMTA instead of letting the Detroit Department of Transportation run public transit for everyone.

Once SEMTA really gets going on its 1990 transportation plan, this multi-county agency will almost certainly have to come to the voters for taxing authority to raise \$660 million a year. Oakland County on Nov. 4 will decide four advisory questions concerning SEMTA.

There's no way in heaven, earth or hell the region is going to vote that kind of tax if it appears only one-fourth of the region, Detroit, is going to get all the money.

Young and Lutz, with the help of the Free Press meatheads, certainly made it appear only Detroit will get the money.

The purpose of staging such a media event was to convince us that President Jimmy Carter has time to show his love to cities while wrestling with the problems of the world. That's standard election-year procedure.

But those of us who support rapid transit, the subway and SEMTA were genuinely embarrassed that the head of UMTA acted as if the money were going to 2 Woodward Ave. instead of to General Manager Larry Salci in the SEMTA office up the street.

Obesity: Many fat cells vs. large fat cells

Question: Is it true that a child's physical activity and eating habits may influence his fat cell development and potential for obesity? Please explain.

--J.K., Southfield

Recent techniques for counting and sizing fat cells have permitted researchers to better define the cellular composition of body fat stores.

These findings have led to the "fat cell theory" of obesity. Research findings to date suggest:

- 1) Fat cells are specialized fat storage cells that may increase in size and number by overfeeding and/or underexercising.
- 2) The number of fat cells in the body is estab-

lished primarily during periods of rapid growth, e.g., during the first year of infancy and adolescence.

3) Once established, the number of fat cells remains fixed, though their size decreases with weight loss. These cells remain for life and may exert an influence on the appetite when they are not filled.

4) A comparison of grossly obese and normal adults reveals that, in the obese, while fat cell size is slightly increased, cell number is considerably greater. Hence, the obese person's excess body fat is predominantly the result of a large increase in fat cell numbers.

THESE RESEARCH findings suggest this cautious conclusion:

Gross obesity (typically of childhood onset) is the result of abnormally large numbers of fat cells formed during growth. In contrast, recent weight gain (adult onset obesity) would appear to be due to increased fat cell size.

The fundamental question remaining is: To what extent can gross obesity (the increase in fat cell numbers) be altered before adulthood, or is overfatness predetermined by genetic code?

Animal studies indicate that caloric restriction and/or exercise early in life can lead to a permanent reduction in the adult body weight and fat cell number. If the same methods hold true in humans,

it would seem possible to prevent the formation of excess numbers of fat cells during the early years.

Despite the countless weight reduction methods currently available, no major impact has been made in our current culture on the long-term control of gross obesity. Of the possibilities available, prevention of obesity in childhood may offer the greatest potential.

This is only the last of September. God help us when the holiday season arrives.

The service could be remedied very simply if someone would just get off his or her duff and look at the line that is waiting for service.

The other toilet stationed at the park, which is used heavily for outings and sports events, was knocked off its base.

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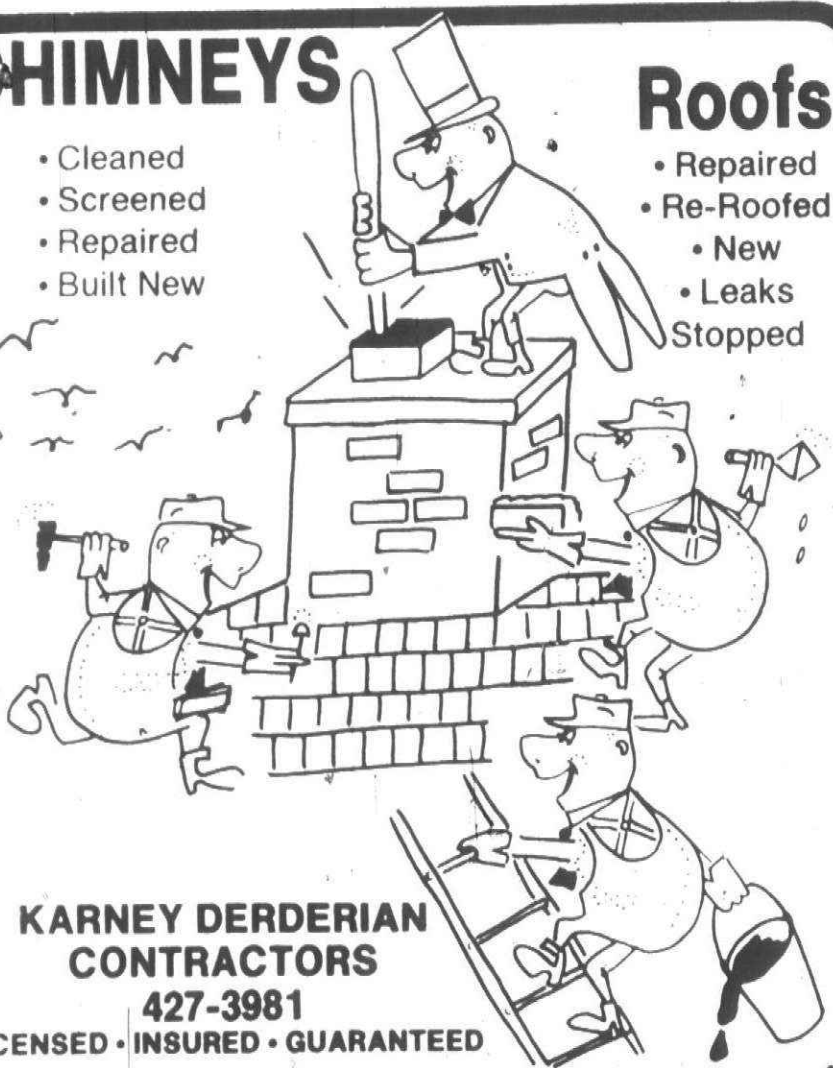
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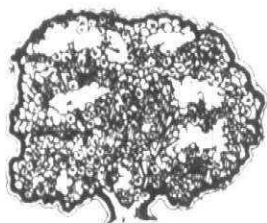


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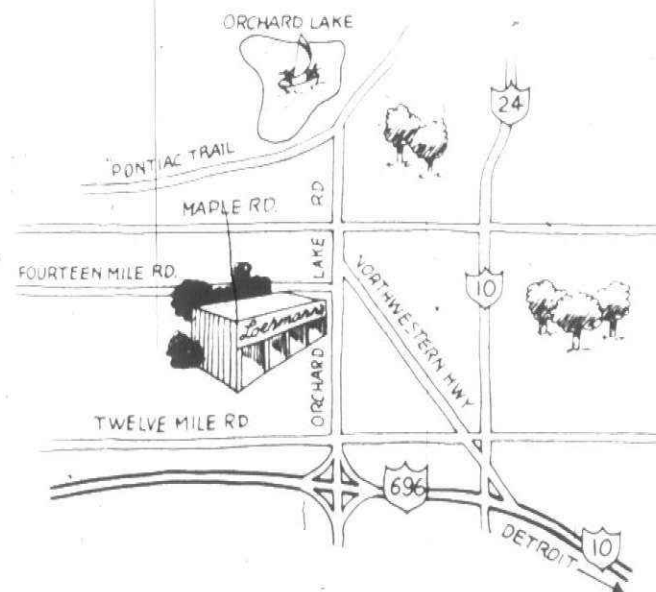

Puppetry widens scope of child's imagination

Take the shyest, most self-conscious child in the classroom. Put a sock puppet on his or her hand and note the change in personality.

"They don't have to be themselves. They're not afraid," explained Beverly Winkelmann, a fourth grade teacher at Isbister Elementary School. "They're not 'them' as they become involved in a creative exercise."

Ms. Winkelmann is one of the 135 area teachers who attended the recent puppet workshop at Isbister. All came away from the workshop full of enthusiasm for the uses of puppetry in teaching the language arts, reading and other classroom subjects.

Jane Zevalkink, a leading professional puppeteer, presented two performances for Isbister pupils in the afternoon. She then conducted a three-hour workshop, "The Art of Puppetry and Its Uses with Children," using visual aids and involving participants in actual practice. The workshop covered three major areas — puppetry making, puppet manipulation and playwriting with children.

THE WORKSHOP was organized under the direction of Jean Knowles, Isbister's library-media specialist, with financial support from the Plymouth Community Arts Council and the Northwest Staff Development Council.

The value of puppetry as a teaching aid has been recognized by the arts council, which has awarded grants to Farrand, Bird and Isbister elementary schools for the purchase of puppet stages.

Nancy Wise, media specialist at Farrand, arranged an after-school coffee Monday afternoon to explain the uses of the school's new puppet stage. Ms. Wise had a hand in designing Farrand's stage, which has special features and can be easily moved from classroom to classroom.

Isbister principal Beverly Marshall, assistant principal James Burt, learning specialist Jacqueline Whiting and library aide Dorothy McCormick served on the planning committee for the puppetry workshop. Mrs. Knowles said Jane Zevalkink had been recommended by Kathy Schmidt, media specialist at Gallimore school, who had seen the puppeteer at the Michigan state library convention.

TEACHERS FROM Livonia, Garden City, Farmington and the Plymouth-Canton schools praised the workshop and added their thoughts on how they would use the information.

The speaker began with simple, basic ideas. She showed how fingers or a fist could be used as a puppet. She demonstrated the use of a glove, a sock and even an ordinary envelope to make a puppet. She brought enough gloves and other materials for everyone to experiment with the techniques of manipulating a puppet.

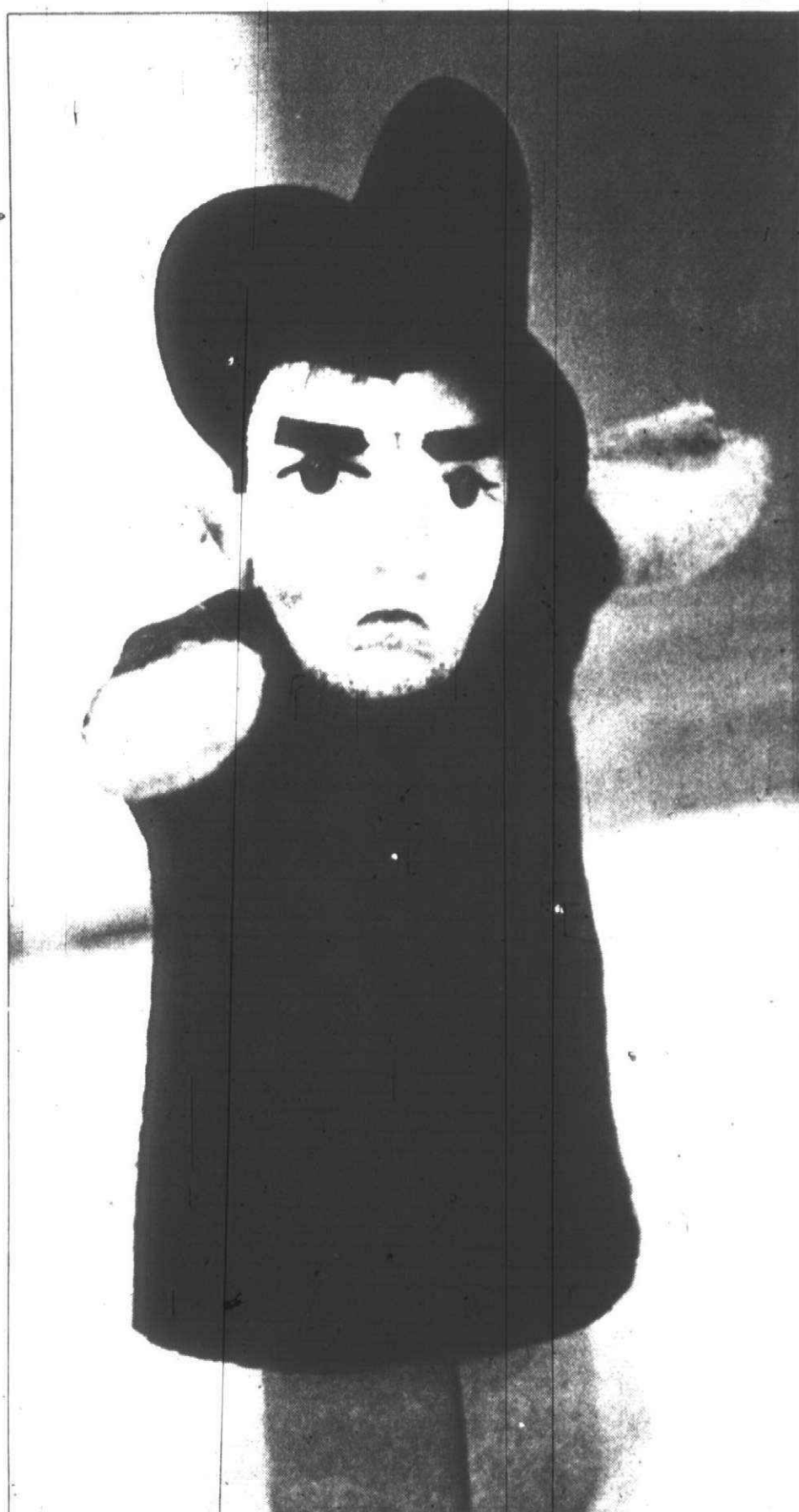
From the basics, she went on to the more sophisticated marionette.

She described the three basic steps in preparing the story line or script for a puppet show.

Special sound effects were demonstrated for thunder, rain, hoofbeats and the like.

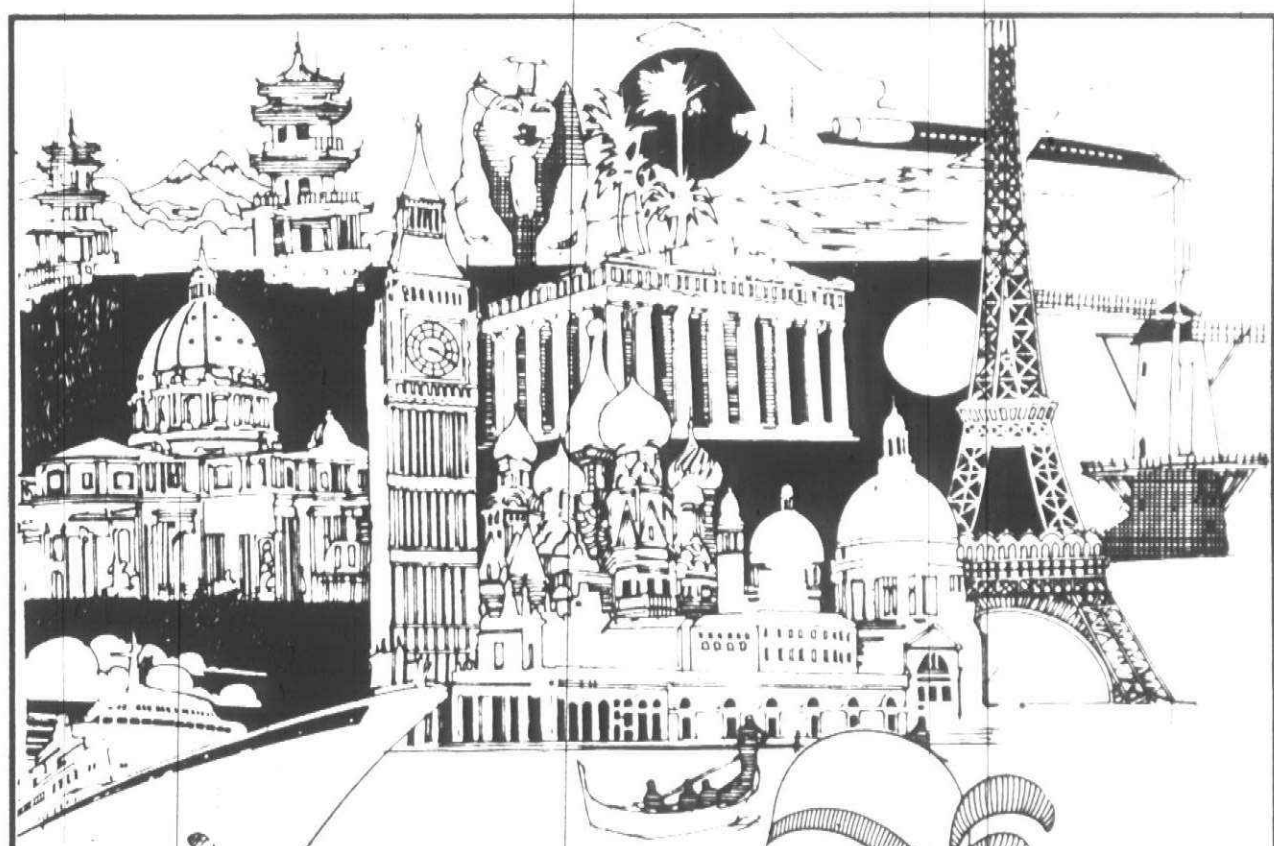

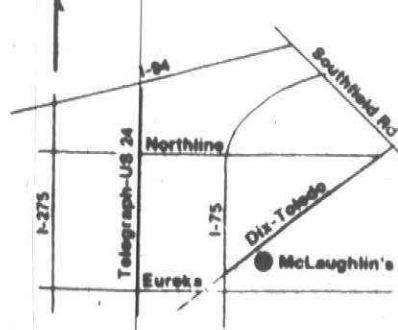
Puppets can be as simple as features drawn on fingers, an ordinary envelope or carton, or the more elaborately fashioned character above.

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Norway's Rigmor

Trolls go to Old World Market

Norwegian trolls and one of their countrywomen will play major roles in the Old World Market that will fill the International Institute in Detroit this weekend.

Rigmor Cuolahan, who left her homeland of Norway 27 years ago and has settled in Livonia with her husband Paul, is market chairman this year.

And she is making sure that Norwegian trolls make the scene there amid the displays that represent as many cultures as you can find in the metropolitan area.

Trolls are of Norwegian folklore.

"If you don't behave, the trolls will get you," Mrs. Cuolahan smiled. "But they are stupid, so you have a chance of getting away. There are many stories about children who were caught but escaped."

"Trolls, with their ugly faces and long noses, live under bridges, in forests and in deep, dark waters. There are five different kinds, some good and some bad."

THIS LIVONIAN has been active in the International Institute for about 15 years because she knows well what it is like to be a new arrival in this country.

She left Norway to marry Cuolahan, who she met on shipboard. He was on his way to see Europe, and she was returning after a visit to relatives in America.

Recently she returned from one of the frequent trips she makes to her homeland and found herself in the midst of all the preparations that must be made for a successful Old World Market.

Visitors to that event, scheduled today through Sunday, will find crafts, gifts, food and entertainment of many nations on display.

"You'll see items for Christmas gifts that are different from what you find in most stores," said Mrs. Cuolahan. "Most of the nationality clubs import what they sell or make them themselves. You can find quite a variety of inexpensive items."

Lithuanian amber jewelry is one of the treasures to be found. "I don't know any other place you can buy it so inexpensively," she said.

There will also be Polish paper cutouts and straw Christmas ornaments made in Lithuania and Sweden.

"It's fun to see that with the same straw, they do such different things," Mrs. Cuolahan noted.

AND THERE WILL BE dolls and table runners from Bulgaria, jewelry from Africa, and Japanese dolls created by a woman who makes them from scratch, including hands made from ground oyster shells. Her current dolls are samurai warriors, said the market chairman.

Old-fashioned American wooden toys will be brought in by a couple from Grand Rapids, and visitors also will see examples of Estonian woodburning, English and Swedish wheatweaving, Polish, Belgian and French lacemaking, Ukrainian and Polish egg coloring, and Ukrainian cross stitching, tapestry making, leather carving and glass blowing.

Entertainment including flamenco dancing, a tamburitzan orchestra, Ukrainian sword dancing, Israeli folk dancing and a Japanese aikido martial arts demonstration, will vie with Irish folk songs and a German chorus.

Hungry visitors may sample foods of many nationalities. The International Pastry Shop will sell baked goods, and a cafe will serve Greek musaka

and spinach pie, Danish round pancakes, Norwegian sausage, Arabic food, and delicacies from France, Romania, Bulgaria and the Philippines.

PROCEEDS from the event will be used by the institute to help immigrants adjust to the American way of life. Located at 111 E. Kirby, across from the Detroit Institute of Arts, the institute gives classes in English and citizenship.

"We have social workers on the staff who try to get newcomers settled," said Mrs. Cuolahan.

The forerunner of the Old World market was a big force in establishing the institute, she added. It was founded during the Depression to give immigrants a chance to sell their crafts.

Mrs. Cuolahan's early contribution was establishing a gift shop at the institute.

"It is wonderful to see so many nationalities getting along so beautifully," she noted. "We all learn from each other. When you get down to basics, we are all the same. Maybe we dress or eat differently, but we're still human beings whatever the color of our skin."

She added that participating in the planning of the Old World Market was "lots of work and lots of fun."

An opening day ceremony today at 11 a.m. will preview some of the performances to be given by entertainers throughout the four days of the market. Hours are from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. Thursday, Friday and Saturday and from noon to 6 p.m. Sunday. Admission is \$1.50 for adults, \$1 for senior citizens and 50 cents for children. Special advance rates for groups are available. For information, call the institute at 871-8600.

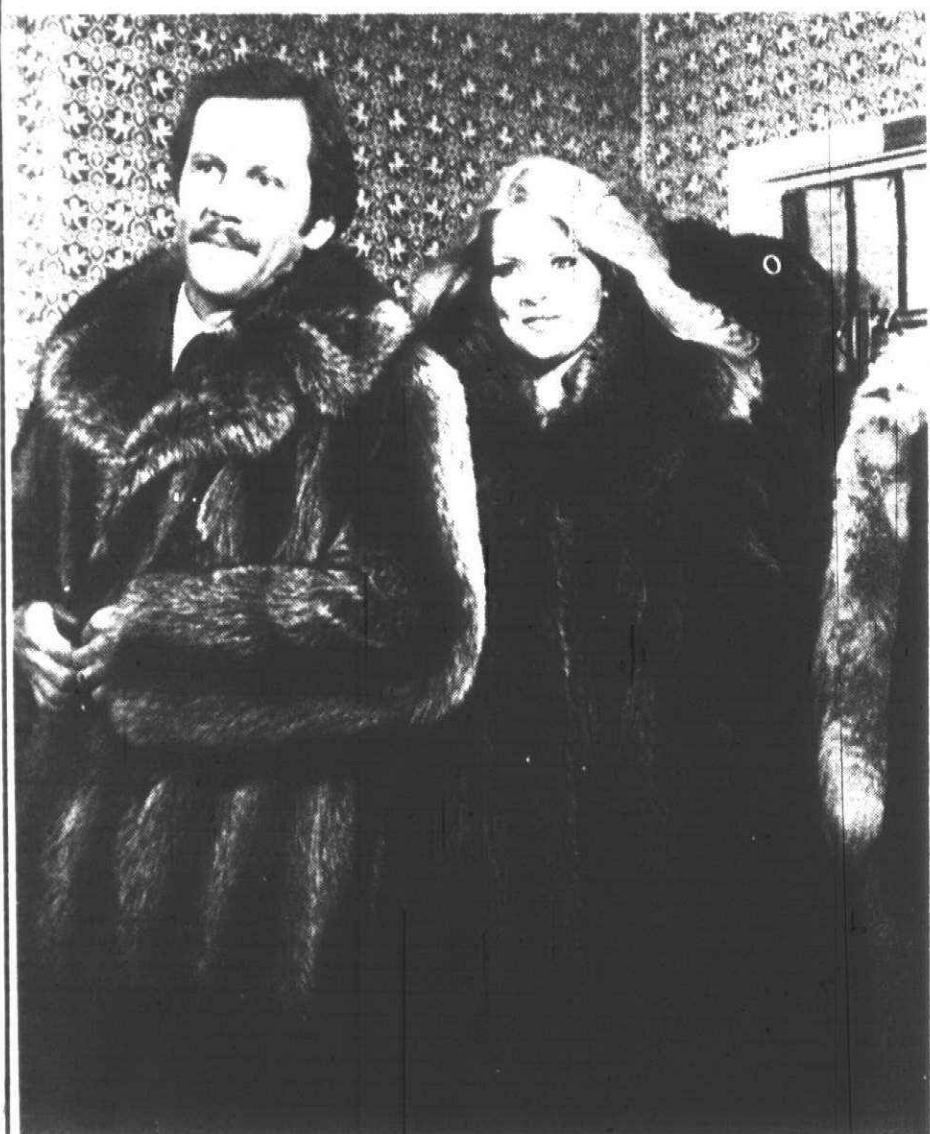
They're all part of MSU's Lecture-Concert Series, which annually brings more than 40 events in performing arts and travel films to MSU's University

Stress Church workshop views ways it disrupts

Coping with the pressures of life — whatever their source — is the theme of a day-long workshop Oct. 18 at St. Paul United Presbyterian Church, 27475 Five Mile, Livonia.

The 9:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. conference will include a keynote talk by Dr. Robert Ward, professor of medical education research and development at Michigan State University, and 14 workshops that bring community people in to discuss many aspects of stress.

The day costs \$7.50, including two general sessions, two workshops and continental breakfast and lunch, and reservations should be made with the church office, 422-0470, by Oct. 13.

"In this program, people will get for the money and time they spend something that could be helpful for the rest of their lives," said Jane Watson, chairwoman of the event that is offered under sponsorship of the St. Paul Church and Society Committee.

"I could not be more pleased with the speakers who will be joining us," she added. "All are fully qualified to lead the workshops in their areas."

INCLUDED among the workshops will be discussions of how stress builds through employment, death of a loved one or one's own impending death, chronic illness, drugs, divorce and the economic situation.

Other topics will be the stress in marriage, religion, accepting handicaps, decision-making, the situation of adult children and retirement.

Jimmy D. Patton, director of client services for the Farmington Area Advisory Council, will lead a workshop titled "Unemployment, More than Money Problems."

Holder of a master's degree in counseling and personnel from Western Michigan University and a licensed social worker, he plans to lead discussion on unemployment, not only from the financial standpoint but also in its relationship to family and self.

Martha Nacy, another counselor with the Farmington council, will discuss decision-making. She is a graduate of the University of Michigan and a graduate assistant in the Master's Clinical Psychology Department at Eastern Michigan University.

Jane Williams, yet another FAAC representative, will lead a discussion on drugs and alcohol.

Chronic illness will be the subject for the Rev. George F. Hazler, Catholic chaplain at Mt. Carmel Mercy Hospital in Detroit. Dr. Marisa Keeney, psychologist and elder of the First Presbyterian Church of Ann Arbor, will lead a workshop she titles "Stand Up and Be Counted."

OTHER SPEAKERS will include June Shada, active in Catholic programs, who will lead a discussion on stress growing from handicaps; Carl Gunderson, former pastor of St. Timothy Presbyterian Church of Livonia and a counselor with the Wayne County Circuit Court Family Counseling Center, discussing divorce stress; and Jack Bradford, also of the center, taking up marriage enrichment.

Marilyn Gunther, director of education at Credit Counseling Centers Inc., will lead a discussion titled "Making Ends Meet," and two other workshops will be led by Virginia Britton and Pam O'Malley, both counselors in the Farmington school district.

Mrs. Britton's topic will be "Retire to" and Ms. O'Malley will consider the expectations and realizations of parents and their children emerging into adulthood.

MRS. WATKINS said the workshop grew out of a single-parents program that the church has run for several years.

"We decided we wanted to plan an annual event that offers people the opportunity to grow in faith and to respond to stimuli present in today's world," she said.

"Hopefully, we will have a program every year. This year the theme is stress, because if we can

learn to handle stress in our lives we can move into other areas.

"Everybody had some kind of stress to deal with. We're looked at every area that causes stress in life today, to try to help people reach some helpful answers."

Preserve nation's land

When I am on the Interstate near Brighton I recall the fuss when the interchange there was first proposed. Some laughed at farmers who complained of the valuable acres they were forced to sell. Others laughed at travelers who complained about the long wait at the old intersection during deer season.

That one interchange now seems a minor part of Michigan farm land converted to highway and urban use. The early complainers don't seem so ludicrous today.

If we continue at the 1967-77 rate of converting prime farm land to urban, industrial, commercial and transportation uses, Michigan will lose 11 percent of its prime farm land before this century ends.

A total of 77 percent of our nation's tart cherries are produced in the region around Grand Traverse Bay. In the last six years, bulldozers and chain saws have destroyed half a million Michigan cherry trees. One by one the orchards are disappearing. The micro-climate required for tart cherries simply cannot be found elsewhere.

NATIONWIDE one million acres of America's prime farm lands are urbanized each year. That equals four square miles of our best agricultural land every day.

Prime land is the best land in terms of soil quality, low susceptibility to erosion, growing season and moisture supply. These best farm lands are also the easiest to convert to urban or highway use.

Farming marginally productive land is costly. More fertilizer, more tractor fuel, more erosion, more irrigation and lower productivity adds up. We all pay.

Projections of the human costs of our current land conversion are sobering. These are not guesses or predictions, but simple projections of facts. By 2000 America will consume all the food it produces and will not be able to help feed hungry people in other countries.

The price of our food will go up sharply, not to mention inflation but in straight real costs. Some foods we enjoy simply will not be grown in quantity enough to get to the stores.

Southeast Michigan may soon not be able to provide the taste of fresh sweet corn, raspberries, musk melon or enjoy cut flowers sold in markets.

WORLD POPULATION is expected to grow from four billion to 6.35 billion by 2000. Poorer nations will experience the worst crowding and food shortages. Mexico City, for example, may reach 30 million.

Poor diet will literally lower the strength and intelligence of millions. International tensions will make today's headlines seem calm.

What can we do? We can urge change in federal policies going in two directions. Economic incentives for development can make leaving prime land alone into good dollar sense. Economic incentives to farmers can get them out of the current pressure where many cannot afford not to sell.

We can do even more closer to home. One county in New York has purchased the development rights for 3,300 acres. Local government can identify prime farm land and protect it from urban sprawl.

When we hear arguments about highways or any construction we must stop thinking it is only one little project. A few more little projects promise our children disaster early in the next century.

WE NEED a new land ethic which treasures America's greatest resource.

The first step is moral and hinges on our attitudes. Beginning with stewardship convictions in worship, we must change the way Americans think about land.

There's help for your losing efforts

"Can you really lose weight through friendship?" reads the first line of the advertisement.

"Lose weight fast" screams another. A phone call to the clinic reveals this is an "individualized" program, suggesting you can diet successfully without anyone's help, except perhaps the "professionals."

Diet clubs solicit and woo your membership. Their ranks increase considerably in September.

Classes on nutrition, weight control, behavior modification and fitness begin again for the season, and health spas and fitness clubs offer discounts on membership to lure you into their "best" program.

There's no doubt about it — dieting is seasonal. Twice a year, in September and in January, everyone begins to do something about excess weight. If you are among those knuckling under again, consider the following before undertaking any program.

IS FRIENDSHIP really the answer? Sometimes friends can

be your worst enemies. As well-intentioned as they may be, they usually suggest that "just this piece won't hurt."

It will. You know it. I know it. And so do they. Why friends sabotage your efforts, I never will understand.

The best friendship diet is one in which friends lend support, but don't nag or offend. It's a fine line, and you may be better off dieting alone.

Diet clubs can be quite helpful, but keep in mind that the people leading a group cannot lose the weight for you. They

may inspire by providing suggestions and incentive, but the buck stops with you, not them.

And any club that is going to be effective for you must have a meeting time, meeting place, and cost and provided a diet that meets your needs.

If any of these criteria fails to fit, the club may not be worth joining.

EVERYONE WANTS to lose weight fast, but this may not be the best way in the long run. Often, the first week of a diet of 1,000 calories a day will result in a weight loss of three to seven pounds. Any expert will tell you this is primarily a water loss.

It's an encouraging sign to any dieter. But a safer, more effective way is a slow weight loss over a longer period of time, about two pounds per week. Two pounds a week may not be dramatic, but does will not cause your body adjustment difficulties.

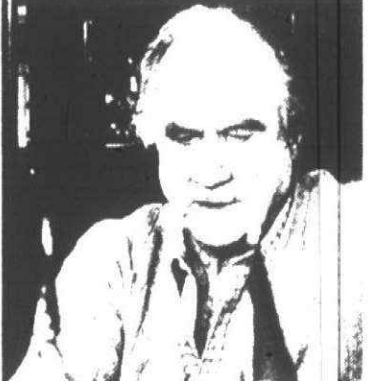

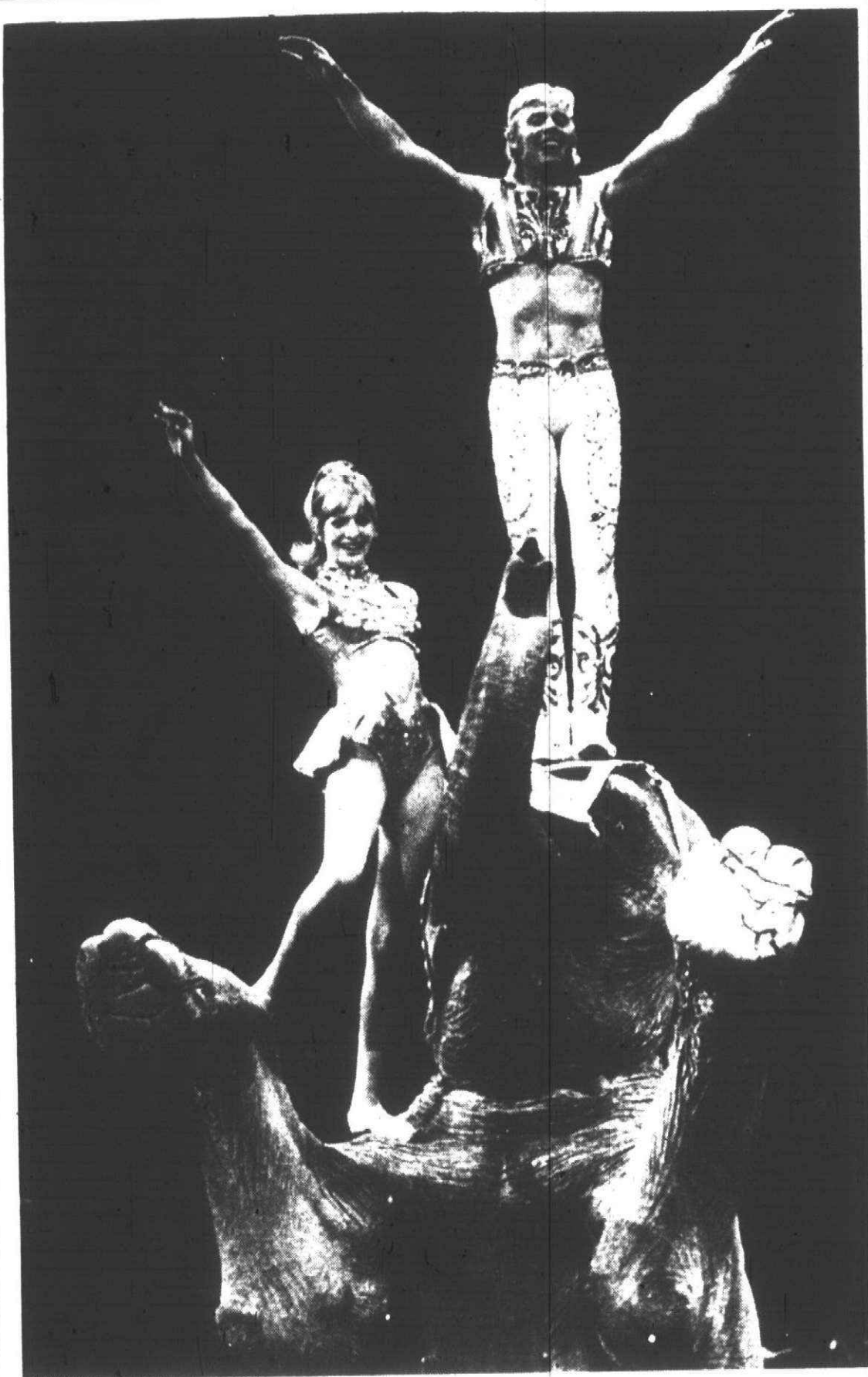

Ragtime

A couple share their love playing old piano music

By JIM WINDELL

Ragtime music brought them together and now it sometimes keeps them apart.

But Bob and Linda Milne like it that way. Often when they meet, it's over their own upright piano on which they both joyously toil, playing ragtime music six nights a week.

Bob and Linda may be the only husband and wife ragtime piano players in the country. Both play the syncopated music of an earlier era at Diggers restaurant on Grand River in Farmington Hills.

Bob performs 5:30-10 p.m. Mondays and 8:30-10 p.m. Tuesdays. Linda works 5:30-8 p.m. Tuesdays-Fridays and then rushes over to Charley's Crab in Troy to play from 8:30 p.m. till midnight. She works the Diggers' 6-11 p.m. shift Saturday nights and is back at the Crab 6-10 p.m. Sundays.

"I DIDN'T know anyone around Detroit was playing rags, but I went to Charley's Crab with a friend and there was Bob playing ragtime," Linda said. "He was not only playing rags other composers had written, he was playing some he had written. To me, that was amazing."

Two years later, they were married.

Both enjoy talking about their music. Linda is demure and frequently refers questions to her husband. Bob deems diffident but has a funny streak that starts to emerge when he loosens up.

Bob Milne not only plays ragtime music in an authentic style, he is also one of the few writers of original rags around today.

"All my life I've been able to make up melodies in my head and remember them. I thought everyone could do that," Milne said. He played his first rag, "Flypaper Rag," for several years before he got around to writing it down on paper.

NOW, HE HAS written some 30 rags, six of which appear on his first album, "Boogie, Blues & Rags," released last year.

"I also write art songs called European lieder. This is a distinctive type of vocal composition that came into being in the 18th century," Milne said. He has written 25 art songs around the poetry of Robert Frost and Michigan poet Stillman Elwell, a personal friend.

"You don't publish art songs," he said. "Publishers can't sell them, and besides that, no one ever

heard of them. I write them and enjoy them and Linda enjoys them."

Milne grew up between Rochester, Mich., and Rochester, N.Y. At age 13 he began playing the French horn and following high school, attended the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N.Y.

During his school years there, he played the French horn in the Rochester Philharmonic. Later, when he attended the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, he played the horn in the Baltimore Symphony.

He had been turned off to piano lessons at a young age. "It was all because of a little Schubert piece," Milne said, allowing his wry sense of humor to show. "It was written in minor, but I played it in major. The piano teacher was horrified, and I said I thought it sounded better. She was furious and I lost interest."

"Apartment" has its share of pathos as well as laughs and splendid performances from Lemmon, Shirley MacLaine, Fred MacMurray, Ray Walston and Edie Adams. Story of ambitious young paper-shuffler loaning his apartment key to bosses for one-night stands won best-picture Oscar. Rating: \$3.25.

"Roman Holiday" (1953), 1 p.m. Sunday on Ch. 50. Originally 119 minutes.

Picture Audrey Hepburn at 24, as a princess, cutting loose for a Roman holiday — incognito. That's the focus of this William Wyler film set in Rome, also starring Gregory Peck and Eddie Albert. It's your standard princess-wishes-she-could-be-a-regular-gal story, except Audrey is charming as can be, and Gregory as handsome. Together they're dynamite. Fifties (and '60s and '70s) heartthrob Hepburn won an Oscar for her role. Rating: \$3.25.

"Seven Samurai" (1954), 7:30 p.m. Sunday at Detroit Film Theatre in the Detroit Institute of Arts, 5200 Woodward, phone 832-2730, \$2. Running time 208 minutes.

Film seven of 17 in the film theater's season-long tribute to Japanese director Akira Kurosawa is "Seven Samurai," considered by many as one of the best action epics in film history. The

plot, about swordsmen hired to protect a small, 16th-century Japanese village from bandit raids, was the basis of the 1960 American western "The Magnificent Seven." "Samurai," starring Toshirō Mifune, won an Academy Award as best foreign film of the year. Rating: \$3.

Milne returned to the piano in college and began playing for sing-alongs. Moving to Detroit, he played at the Dakota Inn and at the Red Garter Saloon. "I fell into playing ragtime," Milne said. "I started playing rags before I really knew what they were. I figured if I hit one hand sooner, it would be syncopated and more interesting. That's the way I played sing-along."

Later, he borrowed a book on ragtime music from the library and taught himself the rest of what he had failed to pick out intuitively on his own. He still hasn't returned that book.

LINDA MILNE came to ragtime through a slightly different route. Her grandmother was a Detroit church organist and a dominant influence in her life. Linda began studying classical piano at age 5. "I didn't even know about ragtime as a child," she said.

In college she majored in French with the intention of being a teacher. Hearing ragtime music changed all that.

"I happened to pick up a record produced by Mike Montgomery," she said. Montgomery is a well-known Oakland County piano player and early-sheet-music and piano-roll collector who is an expert on ragtime and other popular music of the early 20th century.

"I heard Scott Joplin piano roll music. I just had to learn the 'Maple Leaf Rag.' From then on, I played rags."

After teaching herself to play rags through sheet music and records, Linda took her first professional job in 1978 at the Dakota Inn. She came to the Clamdiggers earlier this year.

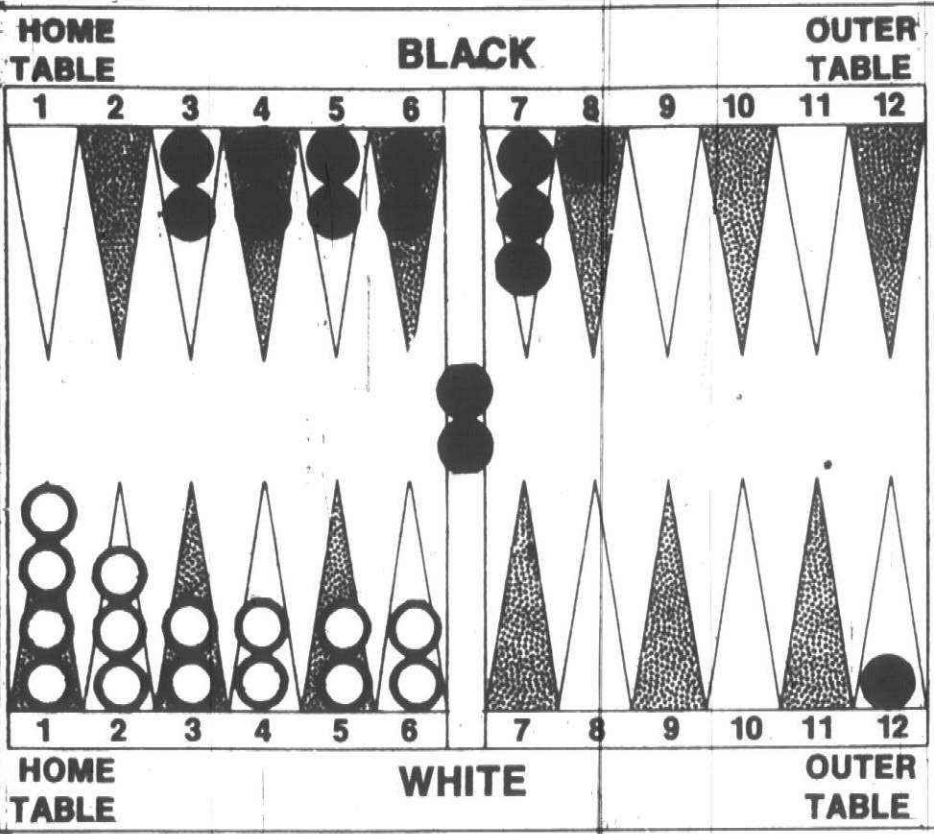
Removing your checkers from the board at the end of the game can become a mechanical process when your opponent is not present to interfere.

In the example, white has rolled a five-one. Since black has two checkers on the bar, what would be your suggested play?

There are only two plays. The first play requires bearing a checker off the 5 point and moving the extra checker to the 4 point. The second play involves moving both checkers from the 6 point to the 1 and 5 points.

The extreme danger with this move is that should white, on his next roll, get combinations of threes, fours, fives or sixes without the one or two, white would be forced to leave a shot. Doubles threes, fours, fives and sixes play poorly also. The odds are too great of this happening — even a second time.



Take the lesser of two evils. By bearing off one checker from the 5 point and moving the other up to the 4 point, your bad numbers are only five-one, six-one, and double fives, fives and sixes. Much better odds than the other play.

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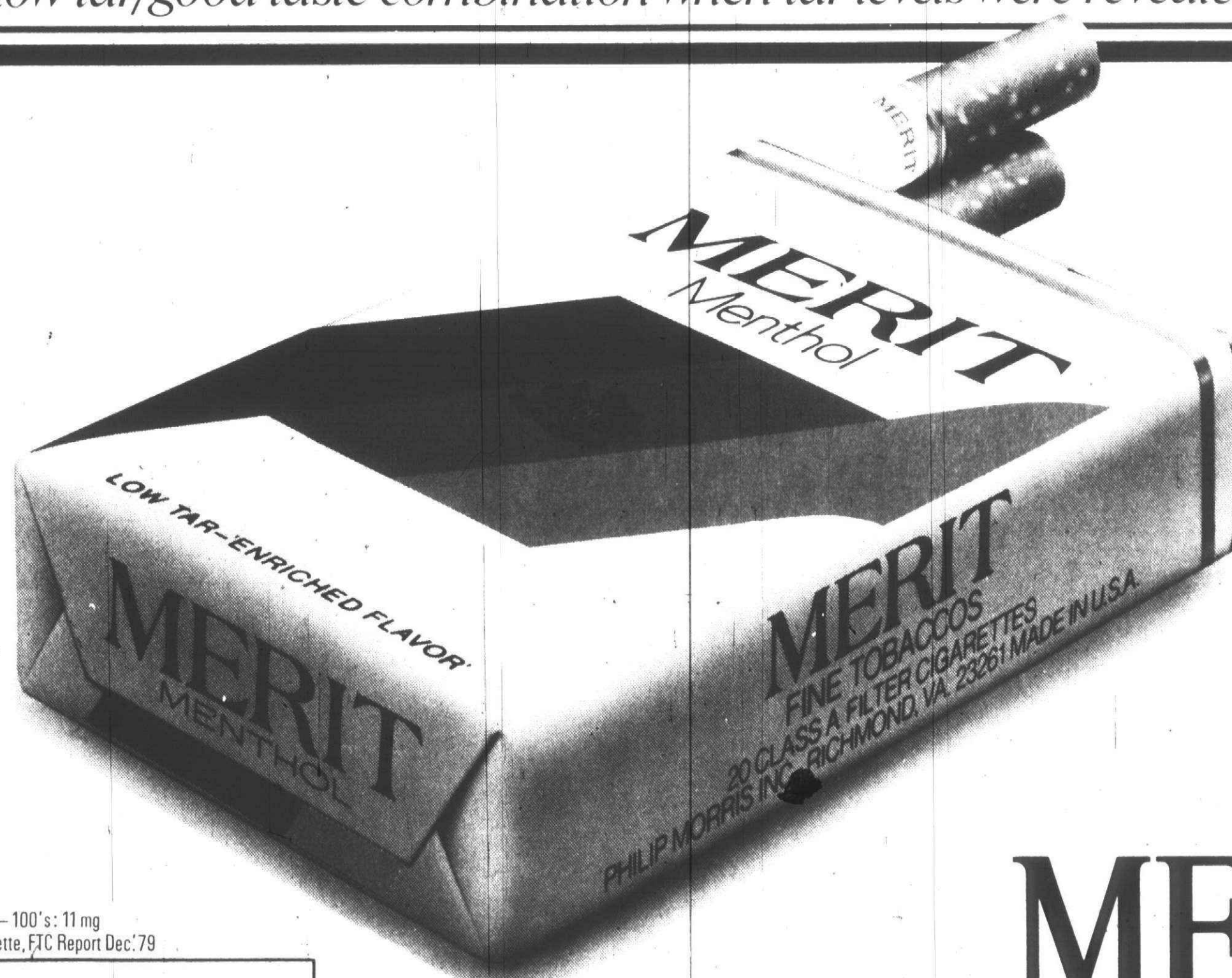
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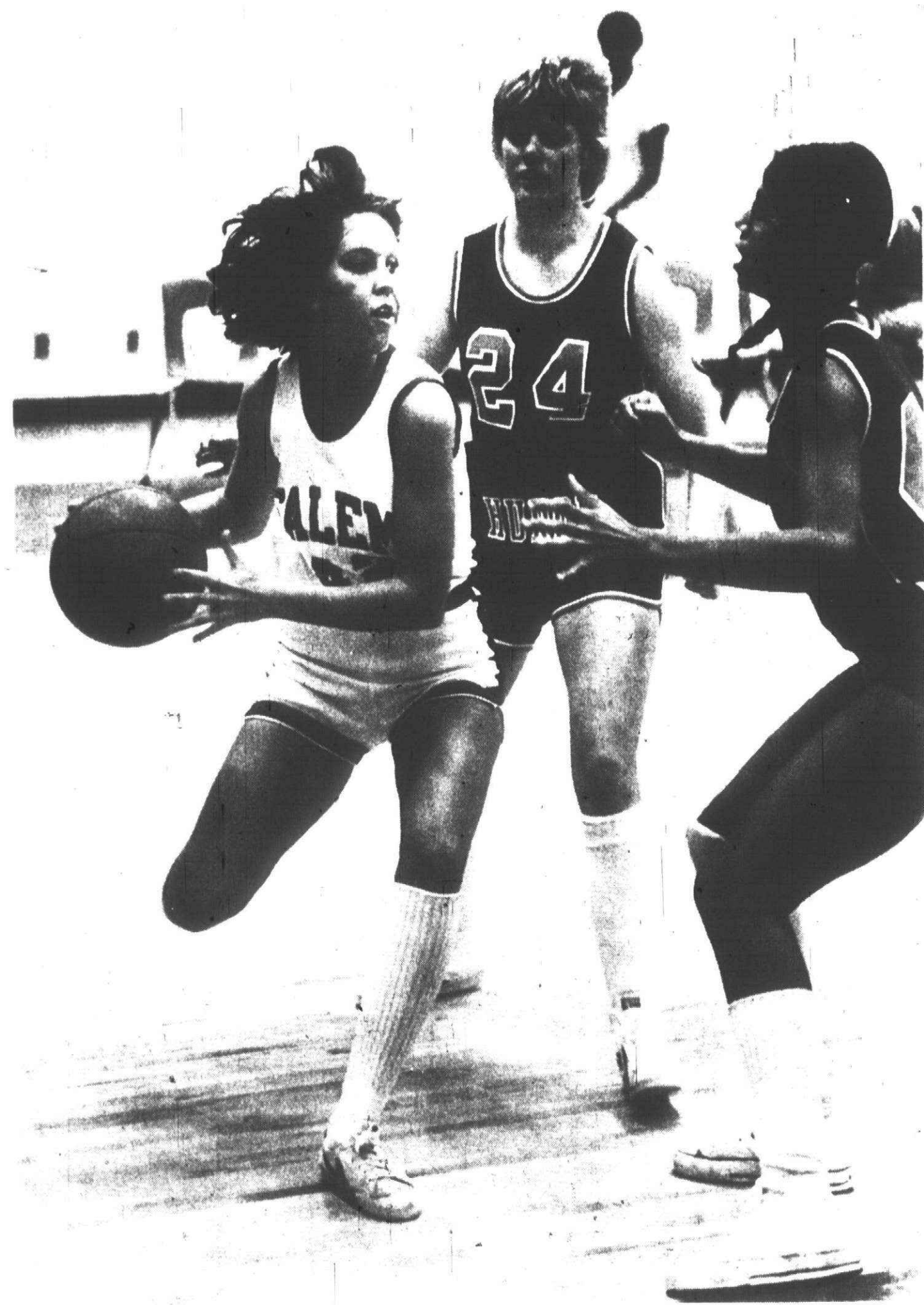

A flyer titled "Michigan High School Girls' Basketball Coaches' Poll" came out with state rankings for the week of Sept. 29. Frankly, it's an eye opener.

A panel of 20 coaches vote on the top 10 teams in four different classes — A, B, C, and D. It represents a cross section of coaches from around the state.

The Detroit metropolitan area, however, the most populous in the state, is represented by just two coaches, Ed Kavanaugh of Livonia Ladywood and Diane Laffey of Harper Woods Regina.

Of course, Flint Northern, with a long winning streak, deserves the top spot in Class A. They are defending state champs two times and are 5-0 thus far in 1980.

Kavanaugh's Ladywood team is ranked No. 2 in Class B behind Flint Beecher. Ladywood's defeat came at the hands of Royal Oak Shrine, a Class C school. Shrine, however, is nowhere to be found, even as an honorable mention pick, in the rankings. I found it to be quite humorous that Redford St. Agatha, sporting a 8-0 mark, can't even gain honorable mention status in Class C.

Of the 20 coaches who voted last week, not one team from that group is

unranked. Negaunee coach Karen Clements, whose team is 2-2, saw fit to put her team on the honorable mention list in Class C over St. Agatha.

Leland coach Larry Glass' team is 6-0 and ranked No. 1 in Class D. He is able to vote for his own team.

Livonia Bentley's, rated No. 1 in Class A in the Observer poll with 7-1 mark, can't even merit an honorable mention by the "coaches poll." Bloomfield Hills Lahser, unbeaten and ranked No. 1 by the Eccentric in Oakland

County, like Bentley, failed to get any mention.

And how about Plymouth Salem, regional finalist last year and upset winner over PSL runnersup Detroit Mumford. The Rocks are 6-0 this fall and were also neglected by the new poll.

The current rankings prove one thing: Some coaches who are voting are volunteering their services for self-serving interests. They are slapping their fellow coaches in the face with these types of rankings.

THE DETROIT metro area is neglected quite a bit in the latest coaches poll. It will remain a joke if the current process continues. This is a bad start for rankings in girls' basketball, a sport struggling to gain fan support.

At No. 2 singles, Mott's Colleen Boyle edged Canton's Lori Smith, 6-3, 7-6.

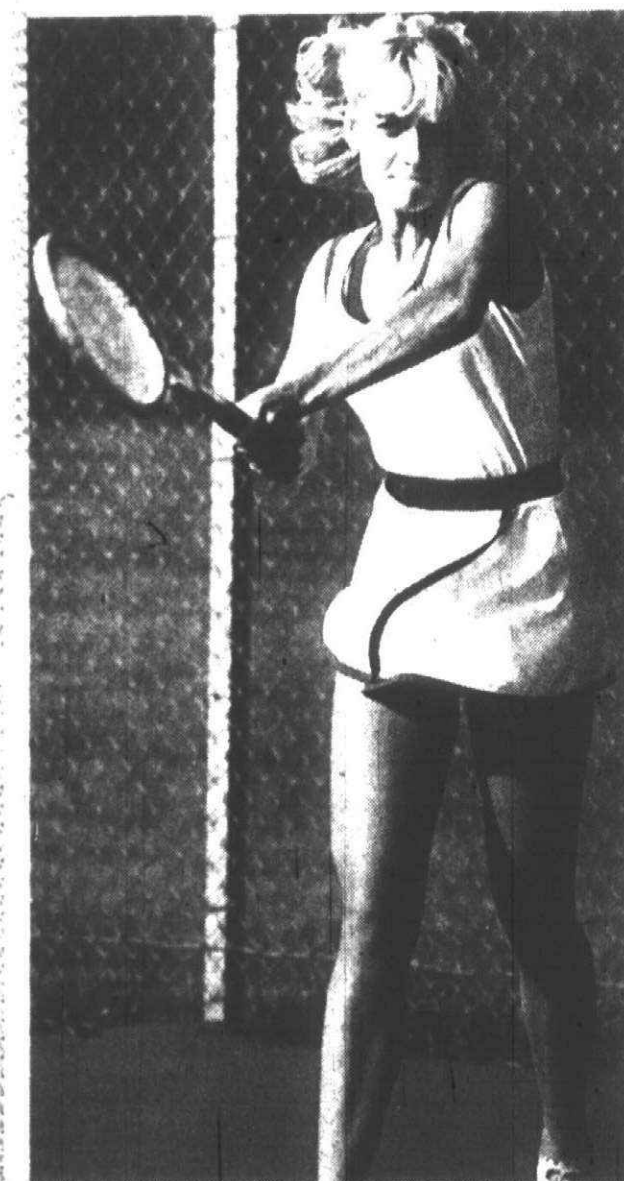

Plymouth Salem, 1-2 in the Suburban Eight League, will travel to Allen Park (1-3 for the season) at 8 p.m. Friday in another area game.

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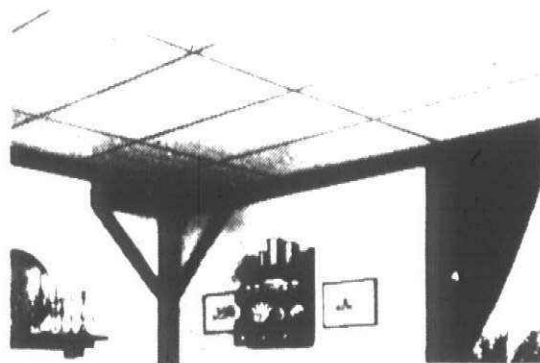
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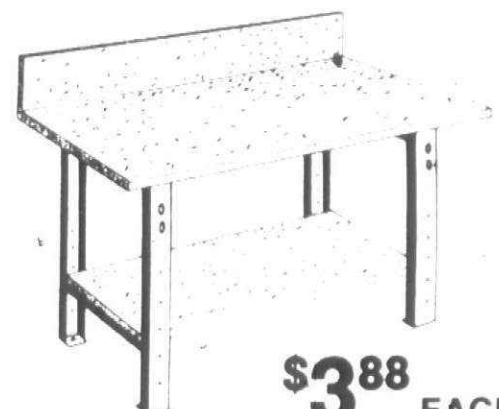


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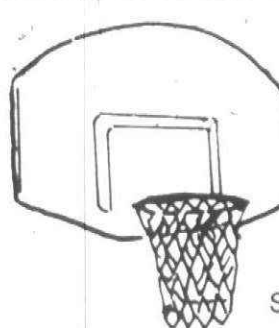

Not far behind these heavy toppers came Dennis Seeman, who used a middle game of 248 for 689. There were 58 double-century games in the league that is only four weeks old.

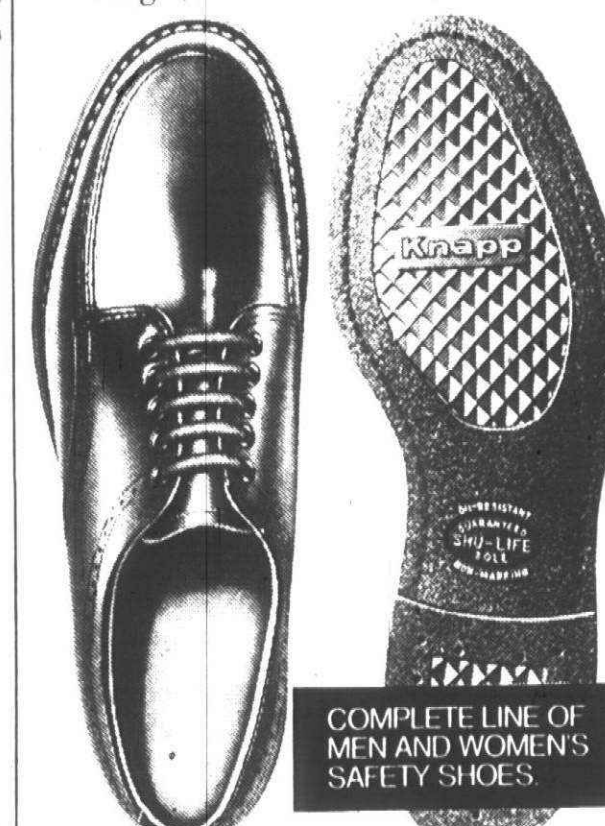
IN THE LADIES CLASSIC at Livonia Lanes Evelyn Miller did not win a game but took the series with 482-114-595.

Junior Terri Eudy paced Salem with firsts in the 50- and 500-yard freestyle events with times of 27.0 and 5:43.9, respectively.

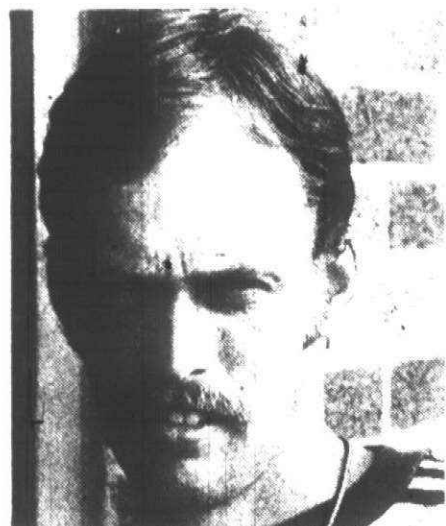
Corinne Cabadas recorded Salem's only other first. She captured the 100-yard breaststroke with a time of 1:16.6.

Salem will travel Dearborn at 4 p.m. Thursday in a Suburban Eight League dual meet. The Rocks are now 1-4 overall.

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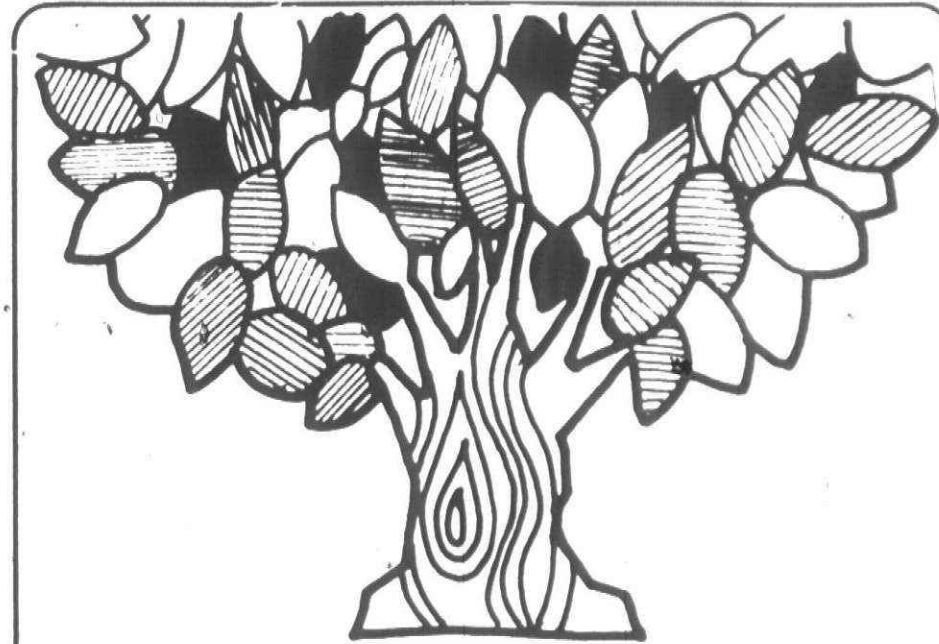
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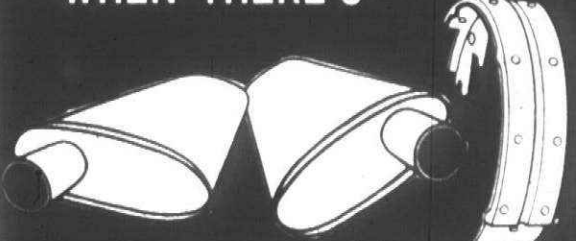

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Carter key to U-M fortunes

It has been a long time since one player has dominated the football scene at the University of Michigan. But, judging from the first three games, the fortunes of the Wolverines will rise or fall on the performances of Anthony Carter, the speedy wide receiver.

This was proven last Saturday when he caught two touchdown passes from John Wampler and missed a third TD, and a winning score, when the ball tipped off his fingers in the end zone in the final minute of play.

Not since Tom Harmon raced up and down the gridiron for the Maize and Blue in the late 30's has so much depended on one player. And now many of the critics — and even some of the coaches agree that the success of the team will depend on Carter, whose speciality is catching passes, running back kick-offs and punts and being a constant threat.

ANOTHER major role he has been playing, though little has been said about it, is that he is just about forcing Coach Bo Schembechler to change his style of option football to the wide open game.

Bo just about admitted that last Saturday when he started John Wampler at quarterback in place of Rich Hewlett, the former Plymouth Salem star, and kept him in the game to the final gun.

Walking off the field, Schembechler realized what was happening and remarked, "I don't want a passing team". But that seems his only choice with Carter on the loose.

"Carter could take us to the annual meeting with Ohio State for the Big Ten title," Don Lund, the assistant athletic director, remarked in the press box. He is just that good and Bo will have to use him as he did today.

Another who places Michigan's hopes on the flashy runner is Bennie Oosterbaan, the former coach and Michigan's all-time All-American.

"HE IS ALWAYS a threat when he is in there," Bennie explained, "and there is no telling when he will get away and change the entire trend of a game."

When asked if he thought Carter would force Bo to discard the option offense, Bennie answered:

"What else can he do with a fellow like Carter in the line-up. He has to rely on Carter's speed and go for the long gains."

Bo is predicting another "knee knocker" this Saturday when California invades the stadium with Rich Campbell, another Heisman Trophy candidate. It will be the last game before Michigan returns to conference play.

And Carter will be the player to watch when Michigan tries to end the slump that brought defeat in five of the last six games three of which came in the final three last season.

Franklin cagers nip Farmington

"We were determined to get back on the track here after two heartbreaking losses. We went out there and got them early," said Stevenson coach Jim George.

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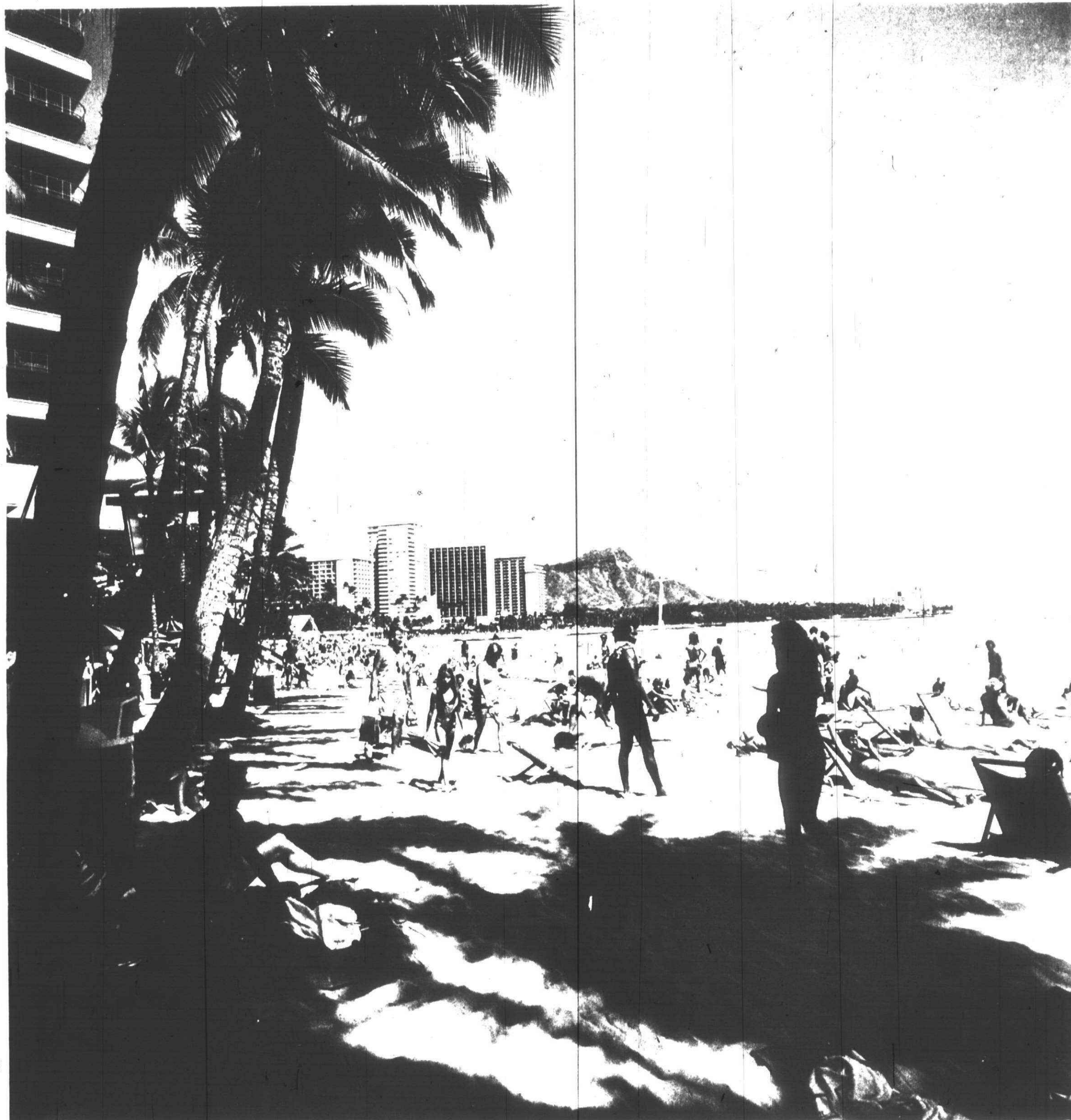
