

Wild police chase triggers sticky questions

What kinds of police incidents or suspected crimes justify the potential danger of a high-speed chase along city streets or highways?

Police admit that chasing a suspect can be risky, and should be justified by the "gravity" of the alleged incident.

Consider this scenario, which took place earlier this week: The radio in a police car blurs a message of a shooting in the city of Wayne.

A "subject" (suspect) in a white Toyota truck has escaped in that incident and is driving through western Wayne County "shooting at police."

That message last Monday afternoon

prompted a chase that reached speeds of 80-100 mph, according to a witness. There were unsuccessful roadblocks along the route, which went from the city of Wayne through Canton Township and into Washtenaw County.

THIRTY OFFICERS from the city of Wayne, the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, Ann Arbor and the Michigan State Police chased the truck along Michigan Avenue, onto I-275, along Ford Road, north on M-14, onto U.S. 23.

It ended north of Ann Arbor when the suspect, Lawrence Adams of Garden City, was forced off the road and shot.

He died several hours later in University of Michigan Hospital in Ann Ar-

bor. Wayne police believe Adams, 37, earlier had shot and killed Morley Shellwell, 45, outside the Parklane Motel on Michigan Avenue, for "no apparent motive."

Police said Shellwell lived at the motel with his wife. Adams, who had been staying at the motel since late September had recently been evicted by the manager.

Family members told police that Adams' marriage broke up six years ago. Adams had been laid off from Ford Motor Co.'s Transmission Plant in Livonia.

NO ONE WAS injured during the

chase. But in recent weeks, injuries or deaths from these Starsky-and-Hutch stunts have sparked criticism.

For example, a 17-year-old woman recently was critically injured in Westland. Her car collided with a vehicle driven by a man police suspected of holding up a florist shop.

A Clawson man was thrown through his windshield and killed last week when the van he was driving collided with the car of a suspected shoplifter who was being chased by police.

In Monday's incident, Canton Township Police officials decided against dispatching cars or trying to set up a roadblock.

"By the time the vehicle had arrived

in Canton, there already were 18 cars involved," said Police Chief Jerry Cox. "It seemed fruitless to make it number 19."

Cox said he discourages high-speed chases. The exceptions, he said, are in cases of serious assaults, suspected homicides or thefts involving large amounts of money (such as a bank robbery), or if giving chase were the only way a suspect could be identified.

But often the decision to chase boils down to an individual officer's perception.

"The primary criterion is the gravity of the crime," said Cox. "There is justifiable controversy. The patrol officer has the information."

Sometimes a routine traffic stop "snowballs" into a chase if the motorist is trying to cover up a previous crime, said Cox.

"In that situation (this week), you had an individual who had shot at least one person (and) who was fleeing and hanging out the window shooting."

ANDREW PRUNER knows well how dangerous that situation was.

Pruner, 41, a Wayne County deputy sheriff, took part in the chase and was instrumental in catching up with Adams.

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Board holds line in '81 budget

For the second year in a row, Canton officials have adopted an operating budget which totals less than that of the previous year.

The 1981 budget, effective Jan. 1, balances revenues and expenditures at \$3.93 million. That's \$200,000 less than the \$4.1 million budget revised in mid-year for 1980. Actual revenues now are expected to total only \$3.95 million by year's end, because of a sharp decline in building permit revenues.

The adopted budget for 1981 carries a net, half-mill decrease as well as a drop in the bottom line.

An expected \$1 million increase in state revenues offsets much of the loss in tax dollars. A hike in the township's state equalized value (SEV) and a corresponding increase in the value of one mill brings expected 1981 revenues within \$20,000 of actual revenues predicted for this year.

State revenues are expected to increase dramatically in 1981 because of this year's census, which pegged Canton's population at 48,000. Only 11,000 residents were counted in Canton during the previous federal census in 1970.

The \$3.93 million operating budget was adopted by the Township Board Tuesday night along with a \$1.4 million budget for the police department and a \$1.3 million budget for the fire department.

MILLAGE RATES for police, fire and the general fund were approved by the board in September.

Property owners will realize a net, half-mill decrease because of the total amounts adopted for all three. The board has juggled the total amounts of the three millage rates in an effort to improve accounting procedures.

Last year, property owners paid 5 mills (\$5 per \$1,000 assessed valuation)

for the general operations, 3.25 mills for police and 1.25 mills for fire. However, two of the five general operating mills were transferred to the fire department to meet actual costs.

None of the 2.5 operating mills which will be levied in 1981 will be transferred to other budgets. Both the police and fire millages have been set at 3.25 mills.

Finance director Mike Gorman called the 1981 budget a "minimal" one. "But it doesn't cut out any services at this point," he said.

The budget provides for three new positions — an industrial coordinator, a secretary for the industrial coordinator and a part-time aide for the grants department. Salaries for all three positions have been placed in the "cemetery fund" in an effort to force department heads to justify the new hires at a future date.

The budget sets aside \$250,000 for

the further implementation of a farmland preservation program. Most other line items have been kept close to 1980 levels.

BOARD MEMBERS approved all three budgets by a 4-1 vote Tuesday night. Trustee Eugene Daley dissented. Trustee Robert Greenstein and Clerk John Flodin were absent from the meeting.

Gorman said revenues in last year's operating budget also dipped below revenues of the previous year. A decrease in state revenues and building department fees accounted for the lowered bottom line in the 1980 budget.

Administrators have based projections for 1981 building revenues on only 80 housing starts. About 500 housing starts were predicted originally for 1980. But Gorman said only about 50 have been reported by the building department so far this year.

In case of Tisch OK

Schools develop plan for cutbacks

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education has been given a contingency plan to implement in case voters approve the Tisch tax-cutting plan on Nov. 4.

The proposal has been developed by the central administration which estimates the school district will lose between \$11 to \$15 million in income if Proposal D is approved.

Dr. John M. Hoben, superintendent of schools, says a loss of \$11 million would mean a drastic curtailment of programs and services.

If Tisch passes, Hoben added, some 500 to 700 school employees would be laid off including 200 classroom teachers.

Besides a shortened school day and/or school year, a budget cut of \$11 million also would mean elimination of: all reading teachers; elementary music, art and physical education teachers; counselors; athletic and band programs; librarians; roof replacement; asphalt repair; and aides.

Cut by 50 percent would be the special education program and custodial services, and transportation services would be cut by 25 percent.

Also to be eliminated, according to Hoben, would be the bus replacement program, more than 30 secretarial-clerical positions and more than 20 administrative positions.

THE SMITH-BULLARD proposal (Proposal A) provides equal funding for every student in the state through a five-year phase-in period by 1986-87 school year, said Hoben, but critics claim spending equal dollars per child statewide will not result in equal educational opportunities.

While Proposal A yields Plymouth-Canton more dollars in the early phase-in years, Hoben added, it is projected the funding would fall behind the present method of financing before the five years are completed.

The proposal also shifts the reduction in property tax to an income tax, said Hoben, and the income tax is a less

stable source of revenue than property taxes.

The legislative-gubernatorial coalition plan (Proposal C) would result in a net revenue loss to Plymouth-Canton Schools of \$157,000 during the first year of 1981-82, according to Hoben.

Proposal C would reduce local property tax for most homeowners from \$350 to \$400 per year while the state sales tax would increase from 4 to 5.5 percent.

The sales tax also is a less stable revenue source than the property tax.

THE SCHOOL administration urges residents to consider the following when voting on Nov. 4:

• All three tax proposals are independent of each other.

• The status quo will remain in effect should none of the proposals pass.

• The voter needs to vote on all three proposals. It is necessary to vote "no" on a given proposal to defeat it, not just "yes" for another proposal.

• The three plans (A,C,D) have many conflicting provisions. If more than one proposition were to pass, the Michigan Supreme Court would rule on conflicting provisions, letting the plan with the highest vote prevail. Where there is no conflict, those portions of all the approved proposals will be implemented.

• For any of the tax proposals to pass, it must receive more than 50 percent approval by the voters.

Renewal date tagged for school millage

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education has reserved Thursday, Jan. 22, as a special election date in the school district.

The election is being scheduled to seek voter approval of a renewal of 10.36 mills now being levied for operation.

Although the school board is considering asking voters to approve a bond issue and possibly a request for additional millage, only the tax renewal will be on the Jan. 22 ballot.

Carol Davis, board president, indicated the school board still is in the dis-

cussion stage on whether to task for a bond issue.

Dr. John Hoben, superintendent of schools, told trustees the timetable was really too tight to put a bond issue on the January ballot.

Tom Yack, trustee, said the board has a lot of massive planning to accomplish for school year 1981-82 to implement grade re-ignment and expansion of Extended School Year (ESY) and needs to know how much money will be available for the following year.

Another nod for Ronnie

Ronald Reagan was the popular choice for U.S. President in a mock election conducted Monday and Tuesday in Plymouth Canton High School.

Reagan received 318 votes to Carter's 271 votes in balloting conducted by the American government classes at Canton High.

More than 770 students voted, or about 40 percent of the eligible student body.

In the presidential voting, independent John Anderson ran in third place with 101 votes.

AN ATTEMPT was made to inform students about the candidates and ballot issues before the mock election was conducted, said Audrey Etienne, social studies teacher at Canton High.

All government students, for instance, received information about the statewide ballot proposals and then visited other classes in the high school to explain the pros and cons of each ballot issue.

Proposal J clause calls for immediate tax hike

If Proposal J, which seeks a three-mill Wayne Countywide property tax increase, is approved by voters Tuesday, the new tax money could be assessed on Dec. 1's bills.

The Michigan Legislature passed a bill allowing the earlier collection before it adjourned in October. Gov. William Milliken signed the bill several weeks ago.

Voters will be asked to increase the county's allocated millage from \$15 to

\$18 per each \$1,000 of assessed value on property. The county, kindergarten through 12th grade school districts, several townships, Wayne County Community College and the county intermediate school district draw from the tax pie, which is divided up annually by the county Tax Allocation Board.

The allocation board, with the support of the county Board of Auditors, proposed the tax increase earlier this year. The proposal has been called a

"limitation" because various government portions of the 18 mills would be fixed if voters approve the increase. Voter approval would make the six-member tax allocation board defunct.

THE COUNTY would get another 1.2 mills added to its tax rate if Proposal J passes.

The extra tax could mean another \$20 million in revenue for the county general fund. The county expects to end the current fiscal year Nov. 30 with at least a \$17.4 million deficit.

School districts would share most of the remaining 1.8 mills of the proposed increase.

The tax increase was first proposed for the Aug. 5 primary ballot so the extra revenue could be collected this year if it were approved.

But the county Board of Commissioners kept the matter stalled in com-

mittee past the primary ballot printing deadline.

The county board concurred in putting Proposal J on the Nov. 4 ballot.

Meanwhile, the Michigan Senate in late September approved a bill previously OK'd by the House to allow all government units affected by the proposal to collect any extra revenue this year rather than waiting until 1981.

All state legislators from the western Wayne County area voted for the bill.

ALSO ON the Nov. 4 county ballot are three proposed half-mill increases authorized by the county board.

Proposal K is a half-mill for the County General Hospital in Westland. Proposals L and M are similar increases for mental health care and operations of the sheriff and prosecutor's offices.

Each proposal would mean at least another \$8 million annually for each of the designated services.

If all are approved, the extra 1.5 mills wouldn't be assessed until next year.

Team patrols on Halloween

Members of the Plymouth Area REACT Team will be patrolling the Plymouth-Canton area during the Halloween period, beginning tonight.

The team this year, as it has for the past four years, will patrol the greater Plymouth community on Oct. 30, 31.

REACT will have a minimum of eight vehicles patrolling each night. The patrol will concentrate on the schools and other public buildings along with the residential areas.

The object of the patrol is to become extra "eyes and ears" for the local police, explains Charles E. VanVleck, president and commander.

"We want to help keep our children safe on Halloween night and to help prevent needless destruction on 'Devils Night,'" explained VanVleck.

Each member of the patrol has been trained in first aid, cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and were taught traffic control procedures by the Wayne County Sheriff's Department.

Each vehicle on patrol will be in contact with a central base station by CB radio so that any problems can be reported quickly to the local police.

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
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Maria Falkiewicz, Democratic candidate for township treasurer, currently is serving as deputy treasurer. Here, Ms. Falkiewicz discusses the issues

Vying for treasurer

2 talk of legislative issues

Canton's two treasurer candidates list industrial development and farmland preservation as the most important issues facing the Township Board.

But Maria Falkiewicz, the Democrat candidate, and James Kearney, the Republican, differ on approaches to the issues.

Ms. Falkiewicz says an industrial coordinator should be hired. Kearney disagrees.

On farmland preservation, Kearney believes the township should work closely with state officials in an effort to pass legislation for a tax abatement program. Ms. Falkiewicz says the program must be resolved soon.

Ms. Falkiewicz, 33, is conducting her second campaign for the treasurer's job. She lost the 1978 election, but won a deputy appointment from the victorious treasurer candidate — James Donahue, who is not seeking re-election.

Kearney, a supervisor in accounting for Ford Motor Credit Corp., is conducting his first campaign for an elective township office.

The two met recently to discuss three questions posed by the Observer staff. Each candidate was given three minutes to respond and an additional three minutes to rebut the opposing point of view.

Following are their remarks on legislative priorities. Some of the answers have been edited for purposes of conserving space.

Question: The township treasurer is a legislator as well as an administrator. What programs do you plan to pursue or introduce as a member of the Township Board?

Maria Falkiewicz: Number one, would be more effective planning and utilization of our staff as far as agenda items. All items that are expendi-

ture of money which goes before the Township Board has to go on a form which goes throughout this building before it's placed on the agenda. We should handle things more professionally on that level.

I realize we have some problems with our ordinances. We're not as receptive to the people, the business community or whatever. That all takes proper planning. There are items which are on the agenda which shouldn't be on the agenda. They should be administrative decisions. There are things that are handled administratively which should be agenda items.

James Kearney: We need to broaden our industrial tax base. We need to prioritize essential services and budget for those essential services.

As far as industrialization, I think it's absolutely necessary that we start developing within the next two years a broader program for a tax base. Plymouth and the other areas have started already. They will get ahead of us. In order to do that, we've made one step forward with the highway supplement program that has come through. I think we can offer an incentive program of free tap-in fees and utility hook-ups or railroad hook-ups.

"I think also on farmland preservation we're in the right area. We have to find out how strong the laws are upholding our zoning ordinance so we know how fast to come with the rest of the program. We need to propose that the state produce a farmland abatement program to remove taxes from those farmlands which are not used as personal property. We need to continue to fund and appropriate through investments funds farmland preservation. I think that, in a law-type approach, al-

lows us to say we're continuing with farmland preservation and protects our zoning ordinance.

Those are my two strong legislative priorities. Other than that, if the Tisch amendment comes through, I would propose that we shut down the recreation department, that we shorten up the planning department and transfer many items to Wade, Trim (consulting firm). We could reduce the ordinance department to some extent and transfer it over to the police department. My thinking on that line is that ordinance is law enforcement, and law enforcement is regularly part of the police procedures.

Falkiewicz: As far as commercial and industrial, that is a priority in this township. I think every candidate recognizes that. We can all speak about it, but none of us have the expertise to know how to carry it through. Internally, we have met with an industrial coordinator and discussed what our needs are and how we should get started. There have been steps taken to go into that direction. I believe our budget, if it is approved, will include an industrial coordinator. We have forwarded people for tax abatements. Our problem is that there is no one person in here (to coordinate this). We've lost a lot of business.

Farmland preservation should be addressed immediately. They should get it onto the agenda for discussion. They should invite people who are directly affected. They shouldn't be holding those properties anymore. One way or another, this has to be resolved. If they decide to go further and they can't get funding, then they will have to go to the voters.

... And list priorities for administrative tasks

James Kearney, Republican treasurer candidate, wants to establish a zero-based budget system in an effort to curb township costs.

Maria Falkiewicz, Democratic candidate, views implementation of a new computer system as a way to make township government more efficient.

Following on their remarks on administrative priorities in the treasurer's department:

Question: Name your priorities as a township administrator.

James Kearney: Zero-based budget-

ing could only be implemented from a legislative standpoint, not from an administrative standpoint. But the treasurer could be the leading coordinator to implement it.

As an administrator, my first thing would be to create efficiency in the department. First of all, we have to get the tax bills out. Second, I'd like to implement a new accounts payable system and reduce the headcount. With the use of the new computer system, I may be able to get it down to one person or under. I would look at the tax bills. I

think there are things that can be done to reduce time in that manner, and cut costs. I have a method of doing it, but I don't want to discuss it in my three minutes.

I would like to work for implementation of the zero-based budgeting system. I would train someone in the treasurer's department for the investment program, which Maria says cannot be delegated. But I say it can be delegated. Good supervision would show you how to delegate it. It is not difficult. All it requires is one person

with the final say so.

After that, it would be prudent to set up industrial-type financing program and also work on farmland preservation with state representatives.

Maria Falkiewicz: Number one, is the tax preparation. There has to be a program established to let the people know what is happening with their tax dollars. There are changes and procedures we're working on right now. Inform them, let them know. I feel the treasurer is going to have to devote a

lot of time to the treasurer's department. The tax area is a problem because we collect only once a year and we have to bring part-timers in.

It's going to take awhile to be able to implement the new computers. It's going to take Mike Gorman and myself and others about three days a week to be able to write all the policies and procedures for the input. The treasurer's department will be the first to go on computer.

Kearney: I'd like to go back to farm-

land preservation. I think it's very possible to propose to the state that we have abatement program. We could have the law changed to allow farmers to come under the Economic Development program and give them lower interest rates than what they're forced to buy at now.

I believe the treasurer department should float those bonds and take care of the administration of those bonds. I think it can be done with the people we have available now.

What are added duties of 1st full-time treasurer?

James Kearney and Maria Falkiewicz are competing for Canton's first full-time treasurer's position.

But Kearney, the Republican candidate, questions the need for a full-time treasurer at this time. Ms. Falkiewicz maintains that the position is badly needed.

Following are their remarks on the added responsibilities of the treasurer's job:

Question: The treasurer's position soon will become a full-time job for the first time in Canton's history. What do you see as the added responsibilities of the full-time treasurer?

Kearney: By law, the treasurer's position is supposed to do three things. It's mandated to take care of the tax receipts and prepare the tax bills. It is to see that the money is invested.

I'm not actually sure we need a full-time treasurer at the present time. As I see the job function itself, it is nice to have a full-time treasurer. One of the things I will do is eliminate the deputy treasurer position on a full-time basis, because I don't think there's enough work to take care of it.

Priority-wise, the treasurer sure make sure we get all the tax receipts. We should be after those taxes which are delinquent. I think we can be a little more current in that situation. I would work to revise the accounts payable position. I would propose to the board of trustees that they remove from the finance department the issuance of bonds and also for providing information to the bonds rating service.

Other than that, I think revisions can be made in preparation of tax bills to make that area more efficient so there isn't such a jam-up at year end.

As for other financial areas, it should be responsibility of treasurer to provide additional coordination in the area of budgets. The full-time treasurer could change the purchasing procedure used in the township. That definitely could be made more efficient.

Falkiewicz: As for added responsibilities in tax preparation, the part-time treasurer has never been able to get into the assessment area, which by law is supervisor. There is no check and balance between tax board of review, all the petitions and so forth. We found there were assessments not added to the roll. There has been no cross check, but there has been no one to do these things.

I have to state that I think there should be a full-time treasurer. You cannot handle the things you have to handle efficiently without that. As far as the deputy, that's still questionable. The investment program alone can take 20 to 40 hours a week.

Purchasing, payables have changed drastically in the last year. By December, we'll eliminate one girl in accounts payable totally. We're going into central purchasing. The (new) computer (system approved by the Township Board) will be a tool.

We've saved hundreds of thousands of dollars in procedures we've set up.

Handling the legislative end and the board and the administrative duties is totally opposite. To handle both of them and the department heads and all the information you have to present, to be able to be here on a full-time basis and make the proper recommendations to the trustees is very, very important.

Kearney: I would like to add a couple things.

As for the investment program, there would probably be disagreements between Maria and I as to which direction the investment program should go. I'm sure Maria would like to go in areas other than securities which are backed by the U.S. government. I am to some extent for that but only on triple A long-term things.

I am not for short-term securities in any institutions other than banks. Given the current conditions, it's far too risky to risk taxpayer money in those areas.

In the future, it's the responsibility of the treasurer to coordinate with finance director the uses and investments of those moneys. The township will be forced to make sure it has funds available before it can allocate them to any expense.

Falkiewicz: There is a new budget act which goes into effect in January. All the preparation which we have done to get to this is a plus. Fortunately, we are one of the townships, which have been written up well in reports to the attorney general.



I think the financial situation in this township today is so much better than any others.

I'm very cautious on investments. I did not have any experience in investments when I came in. In investments, the short-term draws us the extra money we make. If you need the money on Monday, you can invest it on Friday. I get a dated cash chart of what we have. I invest everything I can get my hands on. Trying to keep that organized could be very difficult. You have to pay exact attention to what you're doing. It is something you cannot or should not delegate to just anyone. I see it as a very responsible position. I feel up to this that (the board) never considered the importance of this department."

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Here's a bird's-eye view of presidential debate

While President Jimmy Carter and Gov. Ronald Reagan faced the nation at their first public one-on-one debate Tuesday in Cleveland, Jim Copeland was on the sidelines, sizing up their performances.

Copeland was selected by the Associated Press wire service to judge the debate along with six other national forensic experts. It was their assignment to listen, watch and report to the nation on the question — "Who won?"

Copeland is a Michigan native who now teaches at Marquette University High School in Milwaukee. His parents, Virginia and Bill Morrison, live in Plymouth.

THERE WAS NO clear cut victory for either candidate, according to the seven judges, who based their judgments on the guidelines from the

American Association Forensic Ballot. Six were split between Carter and Reagan and one judge was undecided. He later said if he was forced to decide, he would give the victory to Reagan based on his "super delivery."

Copeland, himself, gave a narrow victory to Carter.

"I felt they were equally disorganized and did not stick to the questions," he said. "Both provided a shallow analysis."

"Though there weren't many facts given, Carter was strong in his evidence."

From a political standpoint, he said Reagan "came across as confident, competent and convinced the American public that he is not a mad bomber."

"If Carter wanted to come across as presidential, it didn't work. Politically, his performance was not disastrous, it

just didn't do any good. He didn't use his incumbency."

Copeland said one Carter flaw was his constant attempt to challenge and "jab" at Reagan's statements. "He came off as really brusk and debatable. And I don't think the American public wants that."

He said, the debate's outcome would rejuvenate momentum in the Reagan camp.

THE SEVEN panelists rated the candidates on a scale of one to five in several categories. They rated candidates' performances in analysis, evidence, reasoning, refutation and delivery.

While some judges traveled to Cleveland, others were hooked into the debate at their homes. Copeland was based at a Wisconsin television station, where he later provided a political commentary.

Copeland believed the debate would

have great impact on the large number of undecided voters, some 20 percent, who were still seeking a candidate to support in the final week of the campaign.

Prior to the debate, Copeland said Reagan needed to avoid his much publicized "off-handed" comments.

He also believed then that Carter would concentrate on Reagan's performance as California governor and would attempt to contrast recent opinion changes with statements the former governor made in the mid-'60s and early '70s.

Copeland said Carter's "best chances" were in his access to detailed government reports which he later proved in providing the "evidence" most judges detected.

Despite the public importance placed on such presidential debates, Copeland suggested that voters base their final decision on information in

newspaper stories and editorials. "You should contrast the two positions and seek out independent sources such as books and editorials."

"However, deciding how you will vote based on a presidential televised debate is probably better than deciding from the bumper stickers you read, or what your boss or union chief has to say."

"What really frazzles me is some people who watch the debate may get the wrong conclusion, but at least they tried. Those who don't watch the debate — I don't know what they're basing their vote on. Certainly, the format is not as good as it might be but at least it's better than watching the 'Dukes of Hazzard' or other such nonsense."

SINCE THE '70s Copeland has co-authored several textbooks on debate tactics for college and high school students. He has coached several national high school debate team winners. In addition to teaching in Milwaukee, he

provides weekly political commentaries for television and radio stations in his area.

Now 41-years-old, he grew up in Ann Arbor and was a 1957 national debate champion.

As a judge in previous presidential debates, he followed the 1976 Carter-Ford debates and the Reagan-Anderson debate this year.

"In the Ford-Carter debate, security was extremely heavy as there had been two assassination attempts on Ford by that time," he said. "Security officers spent three hours combing that auditorium with dogs sniffing for explosives."

"During hour and a half technical rehearsal, Ford was quite relaxed and spent his time joking with his wife, Betty. The difference in the Carter camp was pronounced. His press secretary, Jody Powell, and other kept firing questions away and proved to be quite accurate in their research."

Of the three tax issues, the students defeated Proposal A (Smith-Bullard) with 267 "yes" votes to 369 "no" votes. Proposal C (Coalition) was defeated by 201 "yes" votes to 437 "no" votes. Proposal D (Tisch) was defeated by more than 3-1 with 170 "yes" votes and 480 "no" votes.

Proposal B, to lower the drinking age to 19, was approved by a margin of more than 5-1 with 605 "yes" votes and 88 "no" votes.

Proposal E, the prison tax, was defeated with 252 students voting "yes" and 358 casting "no" votes. Proposal G on legislative immunity was defeated by a narrow margin, gaining 272 "yes" to 280 "no" votes.

Proposal H, which defines the duties of the lieu-

tenant governor, was approved by a narrow margin collecting 279 "yes" votes and 275 "no" votes.

THE STUDENTS voted over a two-day period. On another two-day period this week, a mock election also was conducted in Plymouth Salem High School.

One area of concern in the election was a straw vote in the 15th Congressional District where Rep. William D. Ford, D-Taylor, is being challenged by Ron Carlson, a member of the American Nazi Party who has filed as a Republican.

An attempt was made to make students aware of Carlson's Nazi affiliation and to make sure students knew what the Nazi Party stood for.

With that effort being made, Carlson still fared well, gathering 236 votes to Ford's 299 votes.

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
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

Based on an analysis done by the administration, the impact of each proposal on a family of three in Plymouth-Canton would be: Proposal A, an increase in total taxes from \$1,821 to \$1,951 (assuming local voters approved enrichment property tax millage and property tax dropped from \$800 to \$490) and income tax rose from \$920 to \$1,300 with a new income tax rate of 6.5 percent; Proposal C, a decrease from \$1,821 to \$1,662 in total taxes assuming sales tax rises from \$368 to \$506 and property taxes drop from \$800 to \$516; and Proposal D, a decline in total taxes from \$1,821 to \$1,441 with the only change being a decline in property taxes from \$800 to \$360.

Pruner said the most frightening moment came after he had fired six shots from his service revolver at the truck and didn't have time to reload.

"He (Adams) had the shotgun cradled in his left arm resting on the door," said Pruner. "I was scared. I can still remember the shotgun staring me in the face.

"The state police had closed ranks behind me, shooting over my head at the truck," added Pruner.

At that point, Pruner said he rammed his car against the truck, forcing it off the road into an embankment. Moments later, the state police officers and Pruner pulled Adams from the truck.

Pruner said Tuesday that ballistics tests were being taken. It was undetermined which officer fired the fatal shot, he said.

"It seems it had to end the way it did," said Pruner. "He didn't want to give up. We gave him every opportunity."

Brickley rallies forces for Tisch defeat

As the Nov. 4 election nears, a campaign to defeat the Tisch tax-cut plan (Proposal D) will "bring the people of this state to their senses," Lt. Gov. James Brickley told a gathering of local government officials last week.

Brickley, who is backing an alternative plan, Proposal C, spoke at Schoolcraft College Thursday before the General Assembly of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEM-COG).

Brickley referred to an "assault belatedly mounted to bring out the facts" by Citizens to Save Our State (SOS), a coalition of labor, business, school, senior citizens and various social services groups formed in September to defeat Tisch on Nov. 4.

The Michigan Education Association, which is backing Proposal A, has also launched a media campaign to oppose Tisch.

State and local government officials have stressed that Tisch, which would cut property taxes 60 percent by reducing property assessments to half of their 1978 levels, will cause "devastating" cuts in government services.

A SPOKESMAN for Tisch said Friday that Gov. Milliken was "using elected officials in Lansing to shake down lobbyists and special interest groups to finance a campaign of deceptive lies."

The SOS group began a series of commercials over radio station WJR last week which emphasized Tisch could mean cuts in state police ("three of four state troopers would be laid off"), higher education ("close most of our state funded colleges and universities"), closing of state parks and hospitals, and a curtailment of mental health services.

"You'll lose scores of vital community services, and thousands of more people will be thrown out of jobs," according to the SOS commercials.

A series of statewide television ads will be carried over two of the three major Detroit area stations beginning Monday.

WILLIAM McMASTER, whose Troy-based public relations firm represents Tisch, charged the Tisch opponents with "false advertising."

McMaster said next year's recommended budget for the state police from the state Office of Management and Budget (OMB) was \$12 million more than the past budget year's \$138 million. The Michigan Legislature adjourned earlier this month without passing a new budget.

In his speech, Brickley cited a nationwide study showing "85 percent of people are dissatisfied with the performance of government," but added that Michigan voters have a recent history of "avoiding radical proposals."

Tisch backers say state officials have coerced "corporations, unions and lobbyists who depend on the state government for favors," to contribute more than a half-million dollars to finance a "10-day ad blitz."

But Kathleen Strauss of the SOS group said it has raised "a couple hundred thousand" dollars which will be spent primarily for leaflets and advertising.

State ends college probe

A state audit which recommends several academic and financial policy changes has been applauded as "excellent" by Schoolcraft College officials.

The audit, covering the period from mid-1975 through 1979, was compiled by a team from the state Auditor General's office based on visits during the first half of this year.

Citing 10 Schoolcraft students enrolled in the fall 1979 semester, the auditors said the college "allowed students to continue to register for classes despite substandard academic progress for extended periods."

"Students who are on academic probation or academic dismissal are not required to see a counselor and may continue to enroll for classes," the audit said.

The state report added the college "now has a system implemented to correct the problem."

OTHER AUDIT recommendations included that the food service department seek bids for its purchases whenever possible; that the college periodically solicit bids for vending machine contractors and that building temperatures be reduced during unoccupied hours.

In a prepared statement responding to the audit, Schoolcraft President C. Nelson Grote said the report "contained relatively few comments and no substantive concerns."

The college is not required to follow all recommendations. The last state audit of Schoolcraft was in 1976.

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

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

Skunks invade neighborhoods

Any person knowing the whereabouts of skunks' living quarters are asked to notify the DPW at 453-7737 and the city will send out a crew.

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


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


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Who wants to learn how to build an ice shanty?

My ice fishing buddy, C.O. Jones, must be getting old. He has always braved the elements while on a winter lake jigging for 'gills or crappies. "I've been thinking of building a shanty," C.O. mumbled the other day, as if he were embarrassed to admit it. "Any ideas?"

Most shanties I've seen have been little shacks that were left on a lake all winter and towed off late in the season. There are tents available, but I've seen few in use.

My own idea would be to construct one with hinged walls so you could fold it down and store it in the garage during warm weather.

Talk about coincidences! Tony Brehler from the Four Seasons Fishing Club came by the other day with the announcement of their Nov. 5 meeting, and guess what:

"Highlighting the meeting will be a demonstration on ice shanty construction plus fishing tips and films. The Four Seasons is a family-oriented fishing club, and guests are always welcome."

The club meets at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday in the Jackson Center, Lyndon near Hubbard (between Five Mile and Schoolcraft) in Livonia.

Karl Schipper will conduct the demonstration. The club is planning two ice fishing events for January.

There's no question that ice fishing is more comfortable in a shanty. Walking around the block in winter, you have no idea how cold you can get. You find out when you sit in one spot on the ice and your body loses heat.

My own notion is that you're never cold when the fish are biting, but you get frosted in a hurry if they don't bite.

FROM THE Michigan Legislature comes word that several changes have been made in the state's snowmobile registration law.

Snowmobiles must be registered with the secretary of state when purchased or when you transfer ownership.

Snowmobiles need not be registered if they are used only on lands owned by the snowmobile owner (or for safety education programs).

The new law raises the three-year snowmobile registration price to \$15 from \$9. By my calculation, that's a 67 percent increase. But it's the sort of thing we expected with the Headlee "tax limitation" amendment. A snowmobile registration isn't a tax.

The \$6 increase will go into a recreational snowmobile trail improvement fund administered by the state Department of Natural Resources. It is expected to raise \$650,000 a year. The re-

maining \$9 of the fee will continue to go into the general fund.

A Plymouth man has been cleared of charges that he stabbed a Wayne County Sheriff's deputy in Hines Park last summer.

The charge was dropped against Donald Hunter, 32, last Thursday following a five-day jury trial in the courtroom of Wayne County Circuit Judge Michael Connor.

Hunter had been charged with as-

sault with intent to do great bodily harm following the July 7 incident involving deputy Tony Shannon.

Shannon was stabbed in his stomach when he attempted to break up a ruckus at the park involving some 30 people. It was reported then that the injury could have been more severe if the deputy's belt had not stopped the force of impact.

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
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
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

C-C states tax views

Prop. D would hurt universities

(An open letter to Plymouth-Canton voters from a Canton resident now attending Central Michigan University.)

A very serious referendum on the November ballot faces Michigan voters.

Proposal D is very appealing on the surface level, but after a little digging one can find it will produce only disastrous results for the state.

Shiawassee Drain Commissioner Robert Tisch has proposed slashing property taxes to half their 1978 assessed values. While this may relieve homeowners of a burden, the state will bear the load in the end.

State services will be drastically cut — virtually all areas will be hit, including education, labor, courts and state police. State employees, like those at the Plymouth Center for Human Development, are likely to lose their jobs. Local school systems also will lose some state aid.

I agree our state tax system needs revising, but the Tisch approach is a band-aid proposal which will severely wound the state.

For your sake and the state's, vote "no" on Proposal D.


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
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

In supervisor race

Culbert should stay in office

If you're looking for an outstanding choice in Canton's supervisor race, you'll probably be disappointed.

Neither of the two candidates — Democrat Noel Culbert or Republican James Poole — shines brightly above the other.

A plus for both is a familiarity with the workings of township government. Culbert, the incumbent, has held the township's chief elective position since 1978. Poole served as township trustee from 1972 to 1976.

But neither could be called outstanding public officials during their tenure in office.

POOLE, a retired Air Force major, sometimes showed a failure to study the issues that came before the Township Board during the latter part of his term as township trustee.

He asked questions that should have been resolved through study of the board's information packet prior to the meeting.

Poole seldom took a strong leadership role on the Township Board or introduced legislation.

Since the election filing deadline last spring, Poole has shown a renewed interest in township affairs. He suddenly has reappeared at Township Board meetings as a vocal member of the audience who asks questions and makes suggestions.

That's not unusual for a candidate.

But what is unusual is Poole's insistence that his suggestions have nothing to do with politics. He of-

ten refers to other candidates as "the politicians."

Voters who are looking for a refreshing, non-political change in government should not be fooled by Poole's campaign. He is just as political as the rest of them.

Poole's attributes include a willingness to listen to others. His administration undoubtedly would be an open one.

LIKE POOLE, Culbert has shown mostly mediocrity during his tenure in office.

He often was criticized for administrative bumbling during the early part of his term. He shows a tendency to blurt out ideas and programs before thoroughly examining an issue.

But Culbert has shown improvement in those areas since he took office in November 1978. Sources inside Township Hall say Culbert's administrative capabilities have improved.

As a legislator, Culbert is an independent thinker. Like Poole, he seems willing to listen to the views of others.

Culbert will never make history as an outstanding supervisor. But Poole gives voters little reason to change administrations at this time.

For that reason, the Observer gives an edge to Noel Culbert in the supervisor's race.

His capabilities as Canton's chief elected official have improved during the last two years. We hope to see him continue to mature in those areas.

The Observer urges a vote for Culbert Nov. 4.



Record qualifies Dem for treasurer

Politics seems to cloud the race for Canton's first full-time treasurer's job.

On the ballot are Democrat Maria Falkiewicz — the township's deputy treasurer for almost two years — and Republican James Kearney, a newcomer to Canton politics.

On paper, Kearney seems to be the best candidate for administrative responsibilities of the job by virtue of college degrees in the financial field.

Ms. Falkiewicz lacks those educational qualifications. However, she has demonstrated competence in the financial area by implementing among other things an investment program which reaped \$1.5 million in interest last year.

As deputy, Ms. Falkiewicz has kept a close tap on legislative issues and programs. On a few occasions, she sat on the Township Board with full voting power in the absence of elected Treasurer James Dohahue, who is not seeking re-election.

Kearney also seems well-versed on township issues.

THE RACE is a close one between two good candidates.

Unfortunately, questions concerning personnel and other issues are clouding the contest. Several

sources inside Township Hall believe persons opposed to Ms. Falkiewicz' election are raising those questions for political reasons.

One question pertains to personnel and Ms. Falkiewicz' supervisory capabilities. One person in the treasury department has charged Ms. Falkiewicz with harassment.

But administrative sources inside Township Hall say the charge is unfounded.

Those sources praise Ms. Falkiewicz for her competence in taking over the reigns of the treasury department. She became the department's first full-time supervisor last spring when Dohahue handed all administrative responsibilities to his deputy because of his own illness.

Earlier this month, the Township Board yanked responsibility for processing liquor licenses from Ms. Falkiewicz. Several board members, who admit their support of Kearney in the treasurer's race, seemed to orchestrate the move, which was based on charges of incompetence.

Canton's politics traditionally have been turbulent. The politicking seems to center on the treasurer's race so far this year.

UNFORTUNATELY, only those who work five

days a week inside Township Hall know the full ramifications of the charges and how much politics are involved.

Voters can only base their decisions on the promises of Kearney and the record of Ms. Falkiewicz.

Kearney holds the educational qualifications, while Ms. Falkiewicz already has proven her competence in the financial area. Ms. Falkiewicz is more familiar with township issues by virtue of her employment inside Township Hall.

The real difference between the two candidates may come in their commitment to township government.

Kearney attempted to drop out of the treasurer's race prior to last August's primary because of a time crunch in running a campaign and writing a thesis for a master's degree.

Ms. Falkiewicz, on the other hand, worked long and hard hours in Township Hall for a weekly pay of \$135 before her deputy job officially became full time.

Both candidates promise a good four-year term in the treasury department.

But the Observer gives a slim edge to Maria Falkiewicz in the treasurer's race. She deserves a vote on Nov. 4.

All 4 county tax proposals deserve a 'no'

We hope that when voters turn down Proposals J, K, L and M, Wayne County officials won't interpret it as part of the tax revolt.

We hope they will interpret it as a rousing vote of "no confidence" in county government.

Year after year, the county general fund runs a rousing deficit — this year around \$19 million.

Year after year, the board of commissioners tries to make spending cuts.

Time after time, the board is frustrated in court by judges who want theirs, by the six elected countywide officials who say they are sacrosanct, by unions who want to have their cake and eat it too.

LAST AUGUST, voters approved creation of a charter commission which, we hope, will recommend setting up a strong county executive and other reforms.

Proposals J-M are all property tax increases. In our view, no such tax increases should be proposed until some of the reforms are in place, if then.

Indeed, the mere placing of Proposals J-M on the ballot can do nothing but make recession-weary voters angrier and push some of the more furious into the Tisch camp.

ALL FOUR county proposals reflect poorly on the politicians who put them there.

Proposal J, the brainchild of the three-member board of auditors, would raise the property tax limit three mills, marking off 1.2 mills for county government and 1.8 for education. The auditors, whose jobs would be abolished by a county executive, had wanted this proposal on the Aug. 5 ballot, when it would likely have helped defeat the charter commission proposal.

There was also some sly calculation that the school districts would get active and campaign for it, and county government could get a free ride. No such luck. The schools aren't supporting it.

PROPOSALS K, L and M are the work of the board of commissioners. Each asks for a half-mill, and each is earmarked for a different purpose — the county hospital, mental health care and law enforcement.

The idea is that if enough folks vote for a favorite program (e.g., law enforcement), that proposal might pass.

It's probably a trick. What will likely happen is that the board will fund that activity out of the voted millage and then spread that activity's general fund money around to other activities.

Besides, earmarking millage for operating purposes is a bad idea in principle. Revenues should be considered as a package, and the budget should be considered as a whole.

We recommend rejection of all four Wayne County tax hike proposals. And let's hope the county gets the right message.

Excellent choices line trustee race

It would be difficult to find a better selection of candidates than those in the race for four Canton Township trustee positions.

Unfortunately, voters must choose no more than four of the eight contenders when they step in to the election booth Tuesday.

It will be an extremely difficult decision. More than half of the eight promise excellent tenure as trustees. Those selected will make legislative policy for Canton during the next four years.

DESPITE THE excellence of all candidates, two contenders shine above the rest.

They are **Robert Padget**, a Republican who now serves on the planning commission, and incumbent Trustee **Carol Bodenmiller**, a Democrat.

Padget is a level-headed, independent thinker who has chaired planning commission meetings with fairness and impartiality. He refrains from the petty politicking which too often characterizes Canton Township government.

Most important, Padget seems to study all sides of an issue before making a decision. His opinion would be respected on the Township Board.

Ms. Bodenmiller is equally qualified.

She has worked hard during her four-year term as a trustee. Besides sitting on the Township Board, Ms. Bodenmiller has served on the planning commission, the farmland preservation committee and the Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG). She views her trustee position as more than a three-evening-a-month job.

She is an independent thinker who, like Padget, studies all sides of an issue.

THAT LEAVES two remaining trustee vacancies and at least three exceptionally qualified candidates.

The Observer recommends Republicans **Loren Bennett** and **Stephen Larson** for those two posts, noting the solid qualifications of Democrat **Larry Bowerman**.

Bennett, a newcomer to political campaigns, cur-

rently serves as chairman of the farmland preservation committee and a citizen delegate to SEMCOG.

He is a quiet, independent thinker who seems well-versed on all the issues facing Canton. He has lived in Canton his entire life and appears sincerely concerned about the township's future and an open government. Bennett would be a hard-working trustee.

Larson has served as a trustee since the summer of 1979 following a board appointment to fill the unexpired term of former Trustee Lynne Goldsmith.

As a candidate, Larson paints himself as a fiscal conservative. As a board member, he has worked hard to place a lid on government spending. Larson has been a good trustee.

NOT FAR BEHIND in our estimation is Democrat candidate Bowerman.

Voters concerned about more recreational offerings may prefer Bowerman as a trustee. He views present economic conditions more optimistically than some other candidates and lists recreation as a funding priority.

Bowerman is well versed on all township issues. He has attended almost all Township Board meetings for the last several years.

THE OTHER TRUSTEE candidates are worthy of mention.

No one can question the active role of Democrat candidate Gary Roberts in township affairs. However, Roberts is probably the most political of all the trustee candidates. He may be a difficult to work with on the board.

Mary Dingeldey has been a constant audience member at Township Board meetings during the last several years. She would make a good trustee, but shows less grasp of township issues than some of the other candidates.

As a full-time farmer, Republican **Duane Bordine** could offer insight into the problems of the

agricultural community. However, Bordine fails to offer meaningful suggestions on many of the issues and problems facing Canton Township.

The Observer recommends **Robert Padget**, **Carol Bodenmiller**, **Loren Bennett** and **Stephen Larson** as the best choices for the trustee jobs.



Observer picks Ford for U.S. House seat

Fifteenth Congressional District voters should have an easy pick when it comes to voting on Tuesday.

The choice is between a liberal Democrat, in office for 16 years, a fighter for workers' causes, and Republican Gerald Carlson, an admitted racist.

Rep. William D. Ford has been a staunch supporter of the UAW's point of view, reflecting the current economic views of laidoff auto workers.

He has been active over the years in advocating more federal support for public education and extension of unemployment benefits for the jobless.

He has consistently increased his percentage of victory every election and last time out had 80 percent of the vote.

From time to time, he is accused of failing to pay enough attention to all of his district, which includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, and two precincts in the southeast corner of Livonia.

In the early 1970s, he faced that type of criticism. The result was a quick decision from the U.S. Department of the Post Office to put a new post office building in Westland.

Ford's record is not in question this year as he seeks a ninth term.

HIS REPUBLICAN opponent is Gerald Carlson, a racist who has been disavowed by the GOP leadership.

Carlson narrowly won the party's Aug. 5 nomination over James Caygill, Woodhaven public safety director, in an upset.

Carlson, of Dearborn Heights, blames blacks for just about everything except bad weather.

The GOP nominee was taken seriously by those who voted for him in the Aug. 5 primary.

But the joke is over.

Carlson's campaign platform is an insult to decent people.

Ford's campaign strategy is to ignore his opponent.

But we believe the type of thinking behind Carlson's candidacy is too dangerous for us to do that.

Joyner merits re-election

When appointed Wayne County Commissioner, Bill Joyner, D-Plymouth, promised to serve full time.

And during his first term, Joyner travelled to town halls and city halls throughout Westland, Plymouth, Canton, Northville and other parts of the 27th District to keep abreast of problems.

After being elected to a two-year term, Joyner continued making the rounds to make sure there is no communication gap.

Joyner has battled to represent the best interests of the outcounty area, an effort best seen when he

took on the Area Agency on Aging and helped in the formation of a suburban group.

Somewhere a Republican exists whose name will appear on the ballot Tuesday as Joyner's opponent. But he has not been seen in Westland, Canton or Plymouth. We, therefore, cannot consider his candidacy.

In spite of that kind of nominal opposition, though, the Observer does not have any problem in recommending to its readers the candidacy of William Joyner.

A charter commission will be elected Tuesday to draft a plan for subsequent voter approval to reorganize Wayne County government.

Among those willing to undertake that awesome task are Republican Bart Berg and Democrat Walter Hink in the 27th District, which includes Plymouth, Canton, parts of Westland and Northville.

Berg is a likeable person with a record spanning more than two decades of involvement as a small businessman in Canton.

He has been president of the Canton Chamber and member of the Canton planning commission.

Berg knows a lot about Canton. But he doesn't know that much about Wayne County, which becomes apparent when he talks about reorganizing the county.

Hink, an attorney, has a much shorter record of involvement in local affairs but has been watching

what is happening to Wayne County since before 1976. As a candidate on two occasions for Wayne County Commission, Hink has argued the need for reorganizing the county.

Hink has specific ideas for reform — such as replacing the board of auditors with a department of finance and electing a county administrator.

Besides a knowledge of the legal complexities involved in writing a charter, Hink also has an analytical mind and knowledge of what has gone wrong with the county.

We commend Berg's involvement in Canton but cannot recommend his candidacy. The job of helping reorganize the county can better be handled by Hink, who has better insight into the job that must be done. The Observer recommends a vote Tuesday for Walter Hink.

long as it does not seek to destroy persons. At the same time, we need to carry out dialogue and critical reflection concerning religious movements.



CHRISTIAN SCRIPTURE warns us that we are not to judge others, but we are to love those who do not accept us or who treat us as enemy. These two


guidelines — the withholding of judgment and the decision to love your enemy — are the true bases of religious tolerance.

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

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


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

Salem netters place 5th in Class A finals

Plymouth Salem concluded its best girls' tennis season ever Monday with a fifth place finish in the rain-delayed Class A finals at Eastpointe Racquet Club in Grosse Pointe.

Grosse Pointe South won 32 of a possible 36 points to claim the title. Birmingham Marian was second with 20 followed by Ann Arbor Huron, third, 19; Grosse Pointe North, fourth, 17; Plymouth Salem and Portage Northern,

fifth, 11 each; West Bloomfield and Ann Arbor Pioneer, sixth, 10 points each; Birmingham Groves, seventh, 9; Bloomfield Hills Lahser, Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills and Midland Dow, eighth, six each.

"I think we achieved our goal," said a proud Salem coach Judy Braun. "We played some of the best tennis I've seen."

"It's pretty obvious we've done bet-

ter than any team prior to this year."

Seniors Betsy Moon and Renee Braun ended the season by gaining the finals at No. 1 doubles. They were defeated by Tracy Echlin and Linda Murtagh of Grosse Pointe South, 6-1, 6-0.

Moon and Braun, whom ended the year with a sparkling 27-4 mark, won four straight matches to reach the finals.

"They've played very well together

all season long," said Braun of her top doubles team. "They had an outstanding season."

The tournament started on Friday in Kalamazoo under sunny skies. Play was then interrupted Saturday because of rain. Many matches were continued at various indoor clubs around Kalamazoo.

With the tournament incomplete, semifinal and final matches were

moved Monday indoors to Grosse Pointe.

Stevenson's most versatile tanker is Jackie Cogo, whose times are good enough to qualify her for six of nine individual events for the state meet.

"She's very close in the 50-yard freestyle and has only swam once in the

backstroke," said McDonald of her star swimmer. "She doesn't dive, of course."

Cogo won the 50-freestyle with a time of 26.0 and anchored the winning 200-yard medley relay team (2:00.57).

Diving is the only event where the Spartans are vulnerable.

Salem swept the first three places. Patty Larson gained first with a total of 173.85 points. Teammates Cindy McSurely and Carol Lindsay finished second and third respectively.

JUNIOR TERRI EUDY was Salem's only individual victor. She captured the

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

Churchill primes for 'giant killer' grid role

Livonia Churchill last weekend proved that it had the mettle to bounce back from a tough football defeat.

The Chargers, which had lost to Farmington Harrison 19-14 a week earlier, whitewashed Livonia Franklin 25-0 in their annual get-together.

Now, Churchill can play the role of giant-killer when Livonia Stevenson, undefeated in eight games, visits 7:30 p.m. Friday.

"I'm an optimist," said Ken Kaestner, coach of the Chargers. "The thing about Stevenson that's so impressive is their great balance. They have a strong line and a great backfield."

Churchill's line and backfield didn't look too shabby themselves in the victory over Franklin.

The Chargers out-gained the Patriots 228 yards to 142, picked up 13 first downs to eight for Franklin and controlled the ball for 61 plays to 40 for the Patriots.

"I think another thing that helped us was that our defense created seven turnovers," Kaestner said. Steve Tracy intercepted two passes, John Colone pilfered one.

Churchill also forced and recovered four fumbles.

Jim Stoitsiadis completed a 30-yard

pass to Dan Crowley for the Chargers' first touchdown midway through the second quarter.

Churchill capitalized on a Franklin turnover for its second TD late in the second period. The Chargers needed three plays to advanced 21 yards into the Patriots' end zone. John Bielis scored with a 14-yard run.

Franklin tried an onside kick to open the second half, but the Chargers recovered at their 48.

Eight plays later, Matt Dixon scored on a nine-yard run.

Churchill notched its fourth touchdown after recovering a Franklin fumble

at the Patriots' nine. Franklin stiffened defensively, but Bielis eventually scored on a three-yard run.

Stoitsiadis kicked an extra-point following the fourth touchdown, the only point-after-touchdown that was successful during the game.

"I thought we would play better (than during a 28-0 loss to North Farmington), except the injuries didn't come around and I guess it took a psychological effect as well," said Franklin coach Armand Vigna.

The Patriots will probably still be hurting when they travel to Livonia Bentley 7:30 p.m. Friday.

Bielis accounted for 72 of Churchill's 136 rushing yards. Stoitsiadis completed six of 16 passes for 92 yards.

Ron Gunter ran for 37 yards in seven carries for Franklin.

GARDEN CITY WEST warmed-up for its date 8 p.m. Sunday against Garden City East in the Silverdome by defeating Dearborn Heights Riverside 8-0.

Warmed-up is probably a bad choice of words to describe the Tri-River League game that was contested on a cold, windy, damp afternoon.

Rich Smith scored the only touch-

down of the game with a three-yard run up the middle on a dive play. The TD was produced during the second quarter.

Quarterback Steve Vamplew set up the score by carrying the ball 30 yards around end on an option play.

Jim Karol, a defensive back, stopped Riverside's best offensive drive by intercepting a pass at West's 20 yard line.

"We played pretty good," said Mike Copeland, coach of the Tigers. "We had one touchdown called back (penalty) and we got down to their two yard line, but penalties took us out of there."

Michigan air attack concerns opponents

If John Wampler and Arnold Carter can retain their health and escape injury the rest of the way Coach Bo Schembechler and the Michigan football team will have the last laugh at their early season critics.

Long before the season opened, the Wolverines were relegated to fourth place in the Big Ten race — and some figured that was even too high.

Then when they won by only a narrow margin over Northwestern and

lost to Notre Dame and South Carolina, many of their followers figured the year may be a disaster.

But just when things looked the darkest, Wampler, a senior who was injured a year ago, returned to top physical condition and Carter, who is considered one of the best wide receivers in Michigan history, made their presence felt. As a result of this passing combination, there is new optimism on the Michigan campus. It is now believed that Michigan could upset its next three oppo-

nents — Indiana, Wisconsin and Purdue — and meet Ohio State again with the title and a trip to the Rose Bowl at stake.

The passing game has been the big booster for the Wolverines' scoring as it opened up the opponents' defense and gave Stan Edwards, the veteran back, Butch Woolfolk and rookie Lawrence Ricks the chance to pick up much yardage on the ground.

Among those who figure the Wolverines could laugh at their critics are Wally Weber and Bennie Oosterbann, of the 1925 team, who are keen students

of the game, and Don Lund, the associate athletic director.

They rate Carter the best wide receiver Michigan ever had. And as Oosterbann explained, "He is a threat any time he is on the field. That's why the backs are able to pick up yardage."

And now that Schembechler had put his option offense on the shelf at least for a while, the power and pass combination could do the trick — with all eyes on the Wampler-Carter passing combination — provided they remain healthy and escape injury.





WHO ARE THE Daughters of the American Revolution? What do they do?

Some people are convinced that they sit around comparing genealogies and fanning each other's patriotic fervor, but it just isn't so.

Ask any of the thousands of mountain children in the southeast who have received their elementary through college educations in DAR schools. Ask the men in the veterans hospitals whose handknit bed socks and lap robes were made by DAR members.

Maxine Willoughby and Gladys Deyo, members of the Sarah Ann Cochrane chapter of the DAR, visited their schools earlier this month. They traveled by bus with other DAR members from Michigan.

"And there were six husbands who went along, too," said Mrs. Willoughby.

Their first school stop was at Crossnore School in North Carolina. The second was Tamassee in South Carolina.

TAMASSEE DAR School is owned, operated and maintained by the DAR. It is both a day school and boarding school. Of the 145 students who live at

the school, grades one through eight attend classes on campus. High schoolers attend Walhalla High School.

There are 34 buildings on the 1,000-acre campus.

"The campuses are beautiful," said Mrs. Willoughby. "The students are responsible for maintenance of grounds and buildings. They work before and after classes and on the weekends."

"October is a beautiful time of the year down there and we had a wonderful bus driver. There were no scares and those of us who drive were not 'putting on the brakes' all the time."

They also visited Martha Berry School in Georgia, a prep school and college, the Heindman Settlement School in Kentucky, and the Kate Duncan Smith School in Grant, Ala.

The latter has 42 buildings on its 240-acre campus. It is a day school, kindergarten through 12th grade — the only junior-senior high school in 100 square miles. The school also is owned by the DAR, which has invested more than \$1 million in each of its schools.

Although the DAR owns just two of the schools, it supports four others with scholarships, clothing and gifts.

MRS. WILLOUGHBY explained the lost "pocket" settlements in the Appalachian area.

"Our students come from families whose grandparents and great-grandparents were educated. Over the years, because they did not have even roads leading to schools in the more-populated areas, the children never learned to read or write."

These are the people who benefit from the DAR schools.

They continue the old mountain crafts of spinning, weaving, pottery-making and wood-carving and the sale of their works helps finance their educations.

Mrs. Deyo and Mrs. Willoughby took along stacks of clothing for the students.

"We already have sent our chapter donation toward the purchase of Christmas gifts for the students. It goes to our state treasurer, then to national headquarters before it goes back to the schools where the gifts are purchased," said Mrs. Willoughby. This way, each gift is bought with one person in mind. It adds a personal touch.


It's not often that a window decoration is an entry in a contest with a grand prize of a trip to England.


ROBERTS SAID, "This is probably the most demanding of all the exciting roles I have been privileged to do."



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
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National winner

Catholics bid their leader Godspeed

After five years assisting with mass in her Catholic parish, Phyllaire Dudley is an old hand at church processions.

But the Southfield teen was just a little nervous carrying her white candle down the aisle Sunday.

For there were 12,000 in the congregation, the chapel was Joe Louis Arena and following her were eight bishops, 300 priests and guest of honor John Cardinal Dearden.

"It was very exciting, but my mouth was a little dry and there were butterflies in my stomach," admitted the sophomore at Our Lady of Mercy High School, Farmington Hills.

"It was a one-time experience that doesn't happen every day."

Gathered together for the largest communion service ever held in the 12-million member archdiocese were representatives of all 345 parishes and missions in six counties. The occasion was a Mass of Thanksgiving honoring Dearden, who suffered a heart attack in 1977 and resigned for health reasons this summer.

Providing music was a 2,000-voice choir drawn from 75 parishes and high schools.

Dressed in a friar-type robe she wears at St. Eugene Catholic Church in Detroit, Miss Dudley was one of many chosen to represent the diversity of the archdiocese.

THE REV. DALE MELCZEK, the cardinal's secretary, said the guest of honor put in no special requests.

"We just tried to truly reflect the multi-ethnic, multi-dimensional aspect of the archdiocese," said Melczek, who enlisted the aid of 27 other priests to pull the event together.

Arriving in downtown Detroit on buses and via car pools from as far away as Monroe and St. Clair counties, the worshippers started entering the orange and red-decorated arena 90 minutes before the 3:30 p.m. service.

Snowmobile-suited parking lot attendants, used to hockey fans, urged each other to "Watch your language today."

"No lusting today, no lusting," advised one burly attendant, poking fun at a recent Vatican announcement regarding sexual relations.

As parishioners found their seats, priests carrying communion vessels were ushered into a small room where white vestments lay waiting for them to don. Carrying ciborium from their own churches because of the large number of people taking the eucharist, they were urged to hold onto the vessel tops so they wouldn't lose them.

Calmly greeting the crowd, which cheered loudly when he entered the arena, Dearden said the service was planned — and then he was told about it.

"BUT I'M HAPPY it was planned," he said, adding that the Mass of

Thanksgiving offered him a chance to thank the parishioners he's served.

In a prepared speech, Dearden acknowledged that the church and community have undergone great changes since he was named Archbishop of Detroit in 1958. And he said a "period of change is one that is marked by tension and strain."

"It is not my thought today to dwell on these evidences of growth. But surely the new energy that is found in the life of the Church since the council (Second Vatican Council) must be a source of deep joy to us all."

"There has taken place a deepening of the faith, an increased understanding of its demands, a greater social awareness of the implications of our faith and a deeper joy in its celebration," he added.

The 73-year-old cardinal recalled as a child being "told to move to the altar in a solemn fashion with joined hands, bowed head and downcast eyes."

"Contrast that with the bright smile and the joy that is reflected on the faces of the persons who approach the Holy Table in our time. It is in a way a symbol of the change that we have undergone."

OFFICIALLY THANKING Dearden was Christine McLaughlin, moderator of the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council, which advises the cardinal.

"It is difficult to put into words all that we are thankful for in you," said the member of St. Clement Church, Dearborn.

"You have been our faithful and prayerful leader, you have touched the hearts of rich and poor alike, you have spoken out and drawn us to be more faith-filled people."

While not near enough to personally thank Dearden, members of the congregation said it was enough that they were able to be there to show support.

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For witches, Oct. 31 is soul-searching time

Diet not new and unsafe

Two weeks ago, a full-page ad appeared in one of the Detroit daily newspapers advertising a "new" diet — The Cambridge Diet.

It was billed as "the incredible super diet." In banner headlines, claims of weight losses of up to "15 pounds in just 72 hours" were promoted. Further claims stated that the "ultimate weight-loss formula would reduce body fat virtually as fast as fasting or complete starvation."

But there was some small print at the lower left corner of the ad, which indicated an improvement in governmental watchfulness.

This "ultimate weight-loss formula" is none other than liquid protein, a pre-digested animal protein, which was implicated in the deaths of 52 Americans in 1976. It is the same product — only with new packaging.

This time, however, the U.S. government jumped in to halt not only false advertising, but the sale of the product as well.

LAST MARCH, when the product reappeared on the market, the U.S. Postal Service started mail fraud proceedings against officers in the company promoting the Cambridge Diet. In July, governmental agencies reached tentative agreements with the company to modify advertising claims.

So a warning was printed, in fine print. It reads: "Consult your doctor before starting this diet. In particular individuals who have heart and cardiovascular conditions, stroke, kidney disease, diabetes, gout, hypoglycemia, chronic infections, the very elderly, growing children, adolescents, or anyone under medical care for any other condition should diet only under medical supervision."

Agreements also led to the advertisement statement that Cambridge Diet product will fill only 75 percent of the U.S. recommended daily allowance of essential nutrients. That information is hard to find — it's in a parenthetical conclusion to a long paragraph.

THE IMMINENT DANGERS of the diet are not diminished. I fear, as before, that people will disregard the warnings of the FDA, and the warning issued to those who suffer various health problems.

This life-threatening diet is no different from the one implicated in those 52 deaths four years ago.

The product is, as it was then, pre-digested animal protein. As the sole nourishment and calorie intake of an individual, it cannot fill the body's daily needs for complete protein, carbohydrate and fat. Because of this, the body will feed on other parts of its systems, including lean body tissue. This could include the heart muscle and other vital organs.

Overweight people are always looking for a fast way to lose weight. They overlook warnings from the medical community, and often ignore signals their own body may be sending them.

Surprisingly, even those who undertake the diet regimen under the supervision of a physician may still risk their health and well-being.

MOST PHYSICIANS are not properly trained in treating obesity, and particularly in monitoring starvation-type diets.

Dr. George Blackburn, chief of nutrition metabolism at New England Deaconess Hospital in Boston, says that he feels most physicians aren't qualified to supervise this drastic diet.

"American doctors are not trained in metabolism and nutrition involved with semi-starvation and cannot and should not approve of its use," he stated in an affidavit.

A significant number of people who died while on the "last chance diet" had no known health problems. Death was without warning in some cases. Cause of death was listed as heart attack.

IT IS theorized by researchers that lean body tissue (heart muscle) was used to fill the body's need for protein.

Another theory supported by the U.S. Department of Public Health is the bodies of some who diet lacked necessary trace elements in the body's metabolism. In researching the deaths of dieters using liquid protein, the department found that in many cases there was a distinct lowering of a specific trace element and this may, in fact, have caused the heart to stop.

Electrolyte imbalances, as well as nausea, cramping, diarrhea, fatigue, and irritability, are some of the other side effects which resulted in hundreds of people being hospitalized. They were among the survivors, some of whom still have side effects for having tried this diet.

The Cambridge Diet is not new, is not fantastic, is not safe, and does not promote permanent weight loss. It is not nutritionally balanced, does not fill the body's daily need for protein requirements, and can cause permanent damage to the body, including death.

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

Museum's classy player piano ready for its concert debut

Player pianos are frequently associated with tinkling sounds, barroom comedies, old-time parties and ragtime and early jazz.

Yet these images are only one aspect of a total mechanical-music phenomenon which was popular in the early part of this century.

Henry Ford Museum, which has a sizable collection of mechanical instruments, recently received a gift that represents the top of the line — a reproducing grand piano.

The Steinway Duo-Art 6-foot grand will one of the stars of a performance in the Historical Concert Series at the museum along with violinist Bruce Simpson.

Simpson will be accompanied by the piano in Chopin's Valse in G major, Kreisler's "Liebesleid" and Borowski's "Adoration." The piano also will reproduce works of George Gershwin, Ar-

thur Rubinstein and Vladimir Horowitz.

The concert, at 3:30 p.m. Nov. 9 in the Henry Ford Museum Theater, is free after regular museum admission (\$4.25 for adults, \$2.25 for children).

The piano was given to the museum by Judith Jacobson of West Bloomfield as a gift from the family of Dr. Samuel D. Jacobson.

Miss Jacobson and her aunt, Beatrice Miller of Beverly Hills, sister of the late Dr. Jacobson, sat in the museum

auditorium recently to hear how the piano sounded since it had been refurbished and moved to its new home.

Simpson was there to play "Adoration," accompanied by the piano. Simpson, a Ford executive, performs as a soloist and is a member of the Dearborn Symphony Orchestra.

"It is nice for the collection to have landmark pieces," said Robert E. Eliason, curator of musical instruments for Greenfield Village and the museum. "This represents the finest level mechanical pianos reached."

According to Eliason, the sound reproduction of the instrument is closer to the original than even modern recordings.

To be able to hear rolls made by some of the world's foremost concert pianists — George Enesco, Andre Benoit and Paderewski and many others — is a unique opportunity, he said.

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

THE DUO-ART ROLL mechanism, one of three major brands, Eliason said, "is capable of accenting one note of a chord and you can hear a single melody line against all the chords."

The piano was built by Steinway for use with Duo-Art piano rolls. When Simpson finished playing and the hall was quiet, Mrs. Miller said, "Many a lovely hour we spent with this piano. Everything I associate with it is family and friends gathering around it."

The piano had been in Miss Jacobson's family since before she was born and was passed from one family member to another — whoever had room for it.

All of the members of the Jacobson family were raised with a musical heritage. Dr. Jacobson, in whose memory the gift was given, was chief of staff of Wayne County General Hospital, but he also organized and played in a string quartet made up of physicians.

Miss Jacobson studied piano and remembers playing the Steinway grand, both mechanically and manually. Mrs. Miller has been active in numerous musical organizations including the Michigan Federation of Music Clubs.

The concert brought back many fond

memories for Mrs. Miller and Miss Jacobson. Mrs. Miller told Simpson when the family had owned it they particularly enjoyed listening to the same piece played by two or three different artists.

Simpson said that since this was the first time he had played with the piano he had been watching the paper roll "so I could see when the chords were coming."

Mrs. Miller said that usually the accompanist adjusts to the soloist, but in this case, the soloist has to do the adjusting.

REPRODUCING pianos were popular before and after World War I. This one was made in 1931; the Steinway Co. stopped making them in 1942.

They are similar in operation to the common player piano. However, reproducing pianos can also reproduce the "expression" of a performance with mechanisms that can vary the loudness of a particular note or chord.

In addition to being one of the stars of the Nov. 9 concert, the final one in the Historical Concert Series, the piano will be used before and after theater events and as a regular concert grand in addition to its function as a reproducing piano.

As I watched another duel of wits between two top players, this position came up.

White, on roll, has a 5-1 to play. White moved a checker from the 12 point to the 7 point. Black, before rolling his dice, doubled the cube to 2. White declined the double, this giving black a one-point win.

Did white make a good play? Why did black double? What is your suggested play?

White didn't necessarily make a terrible play. He just moved the wrong checker. I'm sure white's move was intended to duplicate 5s for black, although a 5-6 roll can hit both checkers.


Duplicating a number your opponent needs in order to hit is excellent — if he doesn't roll the number you're on. If he hits, you go to the bar.

The incorrect play on white's part was breaking the mid-point (12 point) prematurely. Without the mid-point, there is on direct pressure on black's checkers on the white 8 point. Black would be able to move freely at his own will. Also, the mid-point serves as a safe landing spot for white as he attempts to run home.

If white wanted to duplicate a number, he could have moved a checker from the 9 point to the 3 point, giving black a direct 1 shot (11 out of 36 ways) and a 1-6 for a double hit.

This move is far superior since white could cover the blot on his next roll if black doesn't hit and fortify his home board. With this move, if black offered the cube, white would definitely have a take.

Black was correct in offering the cube since white played incorrectly.

Dehumanization is the theme common to these two workhorse horror films. George Romero's "Living Dead," made on the slimmest of budgets and fated for the shillest of drive-in movie lives, has survived all pessimistic prognoses and become a very popular cult, sci-fi film. In between its lurid shots of flesh-eating zombies in action, "Living Dead" tackles themes of isolationism and racism as they apply to dehumanization. Only one professional actor was employed in the making, and it shows, yet that's a large part of the charm of this anti-establishment thriller.

"Invasion" recreates McCarthyism feelings of paranoia common to the

early '50s when "Who Do You Trust?" was as much a work of life as it was a game show. You have to understand that when "Frankenstein" debuted, it terrified audiences as "The Exorcist" scared us just a few years ago. Children had nightmares, adults shuddered, projectionists wore blindfolds. Dr. Frankenstein's monster has since become a joke, of course, thanks to films like "Abbott and Costello Meet Frankenstein" and "Frankenstein Meets the Space Monster." But in 1932, when KARLOFF (as Boris was then known)

backed into his first scene, turned and exposed the monster's gruesome, deathless face, hell broke loose from coast to coast. The film is stilted in ways common to early '30s productions, but it's still one of the classics. Rating: \$3.30.

The sequel to "King Kong," like "Bride of Frankenstein," was played for laughs, but not nearly as effectively. John and Roy Boulton, British filmmakers of the Monte Python-Benny Hill School, created this risqué satire of English politics and mores with a superb cast: Peter Sellers, Terry-Thomas, Richard Attenborough, Margaret Rutherford and Ian Carmichael. Very funny stuff, if you understand British humor. *Unrated.*

"A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum" (1966), 8 p.m. Monday on Ch. 50. Originally 99 minutes.

The late, great Zero Mostel plays a conniving slave in this frenetic Stephen Sondheim musical set in ancient Rome. A smash on Broadway, "Funny Thing" the film leaves something to be desired as the frenzy is stretched a bit thin for the screen. But Mostel and co-star Jack Gilford are excellent and the song "Everybody Ought to Have a Maid" is worth the price of admission. Also starring Phil Silvers, Michael Crawford and Buster Keaton as you don't want to remember him. Rating: \$2.50.

"La Strada" (1954), midnight Monday on Ch. 20. Originally 115 minutes.

Federico Fellini's first great film, like so many of his others, utilizes a carnival motif as a parable on life. Anthony Quinn, a transient sideshow strongman, abuses his "assistant," Giulietta Masina (Fellini's real-life wife), and is taunted by Richard Basehart, who plays a clown/fool in the Shakespearean sense. Masina is brilliant as the wide-eyed concubine who despises Quinn but loves life. Nino Rota's laconically inspiring score, with its variations on circus themes, is the earmark of Fellini films. Rating: \$3.75.

"Knut Rockne, All American" (1940), 1 p.m. Wednesday on Ch. 50. Originally 98 minutes.

If George Gipp — er, Ronnie Reagan — wins on Tuesday, Bill Kennedy will be the first matinee movie host to run a film starring the President of the United States. New political roles for women in '80s

Women outnumber — and outvote — men in the American population, which means that if this year's election is as close as predicted, women may hold the victory margin.

This is one of the possibilities investigated in "Women and Politics: The Invisible Majority," a book scheduled for publication next month by University of Michigan Press.

Its authors are Marjorie Lansing, professor of political science at Eastern Michigan University, and Sandra Baxter, a Washington, D.C., research methodologist.

"Women and Politics" is considered a landmark study of the important changes in the voting behavior of women during the past 25 years.

The authors note that in the last decade — for the first time since winning the vote in 1920 — more women than men have gone to the polls to vote for President.

Additionally, significant numbers of women have entered politics as candidates, party workers and lobbyists.

The study examines issues related to active political participation by women, such as what women believe about politics, how they view candidates and parties, relatively high voting rates among black women, and voting patterns of men both in the United States and abroad.

"Bloc voting by women could well tip the scales in a tight election," Professor Lansing said in a recent New York Times article.

"Historically, women have not constituted anything like a visible voting bloc. The stereotype has been that politically women don't differ from men; they just participate less. In 1980, this view is out of date.

"The emerging organizational unity of women surprised politicians at both national conventions. Republican women made the Equal Rights Amendment a leading issue; Democratic women defied the Carter convention machine to gain unprecedented platform planks on the Equal Rights Amendment and abortion.

"There will be a feminist vote in the 1980 election. That majority of women and men support feminist issues (equal rights, abortion, pay) is supported by Harris poll findings. However, it is the way women voted on non-feminist issues that may play a key role in November."

Professor Lansing said that "the message is clear; in foreign policy, women as a group are more peace-oriented than men."

"Neither the individual voter, nor the army of researchers, completely understands why people vote as they do. Nevertheless, considerable evidence suggests that women as a group will support the candidate whom they perceive to be the most trustworthy to be a peacemaker," she said.

Both women were honored recently at a reception in Washington by Philip and Sarah Goddard Power. Power is owner of Suburban Communications Corp. in suburban Detroit and Mrs. Power is a U-M Regent and Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Human Rights and Social Affairs.

Caution keeps buzz saw from going out on a limb

A chain saw can be a wood burner's best friend when used properly. If not, it can turn on you viciously.

According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, chain saws in 1979 accounted for about 51,000 injuries that required hospital emergency room treatment.

Howard J. Doss, Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service agricultural safety specialist, said safe woodcutting requires maintenance of two systems: the first is mechanical, the second, human.

To fulfill the first requirement, certain tools beyond the chain saw are a must. These include items like ear muffs or ear plugs for hearing protection, a hardhat (falling limbs less than 3 inches in diameter have killed non-believers), proper fuel and oil containers, wedges, tools for chain saw adjustment, etc.

Proper clothing is equally important. "Garments should be comfortable and allow you full mobility, but they should not be baggy or floppy," Doss said. "You don't want them to get in the way of your saw or get snagged on a limb or brush at a crucial time."

It is possible to overequip yourself so that you spend the greater share of your time carrying tools into and out of the woods. But is will make the job a lot easier — and safer — if you have the necessary equipment to do an efficient cutting job.

If you have the right tools for splitting wood, for instance, you won't use an axe when you should use a wedge.

The other component of efficiency

and safety is the chain saw operator.

"Cutting wood — whether it's cutting face cord lengths or dropping a tree — is tough work, requiring strength and stamina," Doss said.

Whether you are an experienced cutter or a novice, it is important to work steadily and deliberately.

"The most important requirement in chain saw operation is to let the saw do the cutting," said Doss. "This helps minimize fatigue. Don't try to force the equipment beyond what it is designed to do. Taking shortcuts and hurrying around increase the chance of accidents."

Felling and cutting trees leaves little margin for error, so it pays to know what to do and when to do it. Anticipation and planning are important parts of accident prevention, Doss said.

"When preparing to fell a tree, size it up to determine on which side it is weighted so that it will fall where you want it to go," Doss advised. "Make sure the area where it will fall is clear of brush or obstacles that might pose a danger when the tree is being trimmed of limbs."

More importantly, make sure that you have cleared a wide area in the direction opposite that the tree will fall. This is your escape route. Be prepared to use it — quickly — in case something goes wrong," he added.

Take frequent rest breaks. Use these to look for possible hazards you might not otherwise see in the course of continued operation. If you become overly tired, call it a day. Fatigue is a dangerous partner when cutting wood.

air sacs cannot exchange oxygen and carbon dioxide properly. The emphysema patient must struggle to breathe 20-25 times a minute instead of the normal 15. In its advanced stages, the disease is agonizing.

In smoker's emphysema the problem is more complicated, according to research from the National Institute of Health. By comparing lung fluid from heavy smokers with fluid from nonsmokers, investigators found that the second — the inhibiting — enzyme was present but it was not doing its job. A chemical in smoke called an oxidant apparently turns off the second enzyme.

"Every individual who smokes shows some signs of emphysema," said Oscar Auerbach, M.D., who recently was awarded the Trudeau Medal from the American Lung Association for this study that documented the correlation between the amount of lung damage and the amount of smoking.

tax proposals in a nutshell

PROPOSAL A ("Smith-Bullard") calls for cutting property taxes (residential and agricultural) for schools. Requires state to make up the loss to school districts. State income tax would have to be raised to 6 percent or more from current 4.6 percent to fund school systems. To be phased in over five-year period under a complicated formula.

PROPOSAL C ("Coalition Plan") advanced by Gov. Milliken and bipartisan leaders in the legislature: Would cut property taxes by exempting first \$7,100 of residential property assessment. Loss to be made up by increasing state sales tax to 5.5 percent from 4 percent.

PROPOSAL D ("Tisch") would roll back property assessments to 1978 level and then cut in half, resulting in 60 percent cut in property taxes. Would then require state to pay local governments for some of the lost revenue. Any new state taxes would require approval of 60 percent of voters

Funds fight famine

Preventing famine and easing hunger in a dozen developing nations is the intent of a five-year, \$16.7 million research program being administered by the Michigan State University Agricultural Experiment Station (AES).

Funds awarded by the U.S. Agency for International Development will support efforts to improve production and use of dry beans and cowpeas in 12 nations in eastern and western Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean. Researchers from

10 U.S. universities, including MSU, will collaborate with host country scientists on 17 projects aimed at helping small-scale farmers.

"The major producers and consumers of dry beans and cowpeas are subsistence farm families, a group highly susceptible to problems of poverty, hunger and malnutrition," said Patricia Barnes-McConnell, interim program coordinator and MSU associate professor of urban and metropolitan studies.

"Research activities will aim to improve the production, nutritive value and use of dry beans and cowpeas, which are the only reasonable alternatives to expensive animal protein available to farm families and the urban poor," Ms. Barnes-McConnell said.

Researchers will consider traditional family structures and rural population characteristics when designing research to address social and cultural needs of subsistence farmers.
