State slash dips beneath fears of school board

Schools officials guessed wrong and they're glad.

Central administrators of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools learned earlier this week that Gov. Milliken's proposed budget cutbacks won't hurt them as much as anticipated.

Last week the governor announced a cut in educational funding of \$65 million in addition to earlier cuts totalling \$160 million.

Administrators at first feared program cuts would be needed to make up for the lost funds. Their reaction was based on a guess that Gov. Milliken would spread his latest cut almost evenly between state aid and special purpose ("categorical") funding.

But Milliken proposed only a minor adjustment in the state aid formula and took most of the \$65 million from categorical funds, primarily from transportation.

SUPERINTENDENT John M. Hoben told the school board Monday night that the district would lose about \$16,000 in state aid and about \$100,000 in categorical funds.

Half of the categorical loss, Hoben explained, will come in transportation, with the state cutting its busing reimbursement funds to Plymouth-Canton.

Anticipating further state cutbacks, the administration earlier placed \$185,000 in a contingency fund. The contingency fund will more than cover the expected state cuts.

"Based on this latest information, we will end up in pretty good shape. I have to give credit to our business department for some very good fiscal administration to bring us to this point," Hoben added.

For 1979-80, the state general fund spent \$940 million on K-12 education while the governor's latest cut will result in a 1980-81 expenditure of \$709 million.

"What really is happening is that the state is spending less money on education this year than it did last year," Hoben said.

The governor's proposed budget still must be approved by the state House and Senate but Hoben expects the legislative budget to be very close to the governor's.

Some of the largest cuts in the governor's latest budget are: funds to districts with declining enrollments, almost \$24 million; municipal overburden, \$16 million; capital outlay, \$15 million; compensatory education, \$17 million; bilingual education, \$2 million; academically talented, \$750,000; special education, \$24 million; vocational education, \$4 million; transportation, \$48 million; media centers, \$2 million; pregnant women and school-age parents program, \$1.1 million; community schools, \$3 million.

Counting both of the governor's cuts, the district expects to lose more than \$2.5 million in state funding from last year to the current school fiscal year, which ends June 30, 1981.

Canton man faces bank stickup charge

A 33-year-old Canton Township man, already in custody in lieu of a \$100,000 cash bond on state robbery charges, was one of two men against whom federal complaints were issued Tuesday in connection with the March robbery of a Dearborn Heights bank.

Police are investigating to determine whether Thomas Ezerkis, 33, of Honeycomb Street in Canton and Michael Beckius, 34, of Hancock, Mich., were also involved in as many as six other Michigan and Ohio bank robberies this year, including two Livonia robberies.

Bandits wearing masks and white gloves were involved in all seven robberies, which netted a total of about \$60,000. No charges have yet been filed against either man in connection with the other six hold-ups, however.

Livonia police said Ezerkis was ar-

raigned Sunday before 29th District Court Judge John C. Seiler on unrelated armed robbery charges stemming from the August 24 hold-up of an Arnold's drug store on Five Mile in Livonia. About \$400 was stolen in that robbery.

Officers from Canton Township, Livonia and the FBI arrested Ezerkis at his Canton apartment about noon Saturday.

Beckius, who investigators said was an earlier suspect in connection with the bank robberies, was arrested on a concealed weapons charge last Wednesday after being stopped for a traffic violation in Detroit, federal investigators said.

Investigators said the men will be arraigned on the federal charges after they make appearances on the earlier charges in other courts.

New officials poise for dive into workload

Post-election partying will end Friday morning for candidates who have won seats on the Township Board.

They will dive into their four-year terms with a two-day orientation meeting which starts Friday at 9 a.m. and ends Saturday at 5 p.m.

Members of the new Township Board take office at noon today. Judge James Garber of the 35th District Court was scheduled to administer the oath of office Wednesday afternoon to ensure that officials will be at the helm in case of an emergency today.

Public swearing-in ceremonies are scheduled for 7 p.m. today in Township Hall — seven hours after the expiration of the outgoing officials' terms.

THE WORK begins in earnest Friday morning with the longest orientation meeting ever held by a new Township Board.

The meeting was the idea of incoming Trustee Robert Padgett, who has served on the Canton Planning Commission for the last four years. Padgett suggested the idea to incoming Supervisor James Poole, who quickly sanctioned the concept.

The new board is expected to make no decisions at the meeting, which is open to the public.

But the new officials expect to soak up much of the background information needed to make knowledgeable decisions in the future. Their first regular board meeting is scheduled for 7 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 25.

At 9 a.m. Friday, for example, finance director Mike Gorman is scheduled to make a two-hour presentation on the township's administrative set-up, financial status and other related matters. New officials will meet with attorneys in closed session late Friday afternoon to discuss the status of pending litigation and labor-contract talks.

"I guess (the idea) comes from my organizational background," said Padgett, who is a supervisor of Ford Motor Co.'s central computer operations.

"The first thing you do when you step into a new management position is to get a good briefing of what's going on."

"Obviously a couple of board members don't need this," said Padgett in reference to second-term Trustees Carol Bodenmiller, second-term Trustee Stephen Larson and 11th-term Clerk John Flodin. "But the rest of us need a rather extensive briefing to be able to handle our responsibilities."

It's moving time for Culbert

Supervisor Noel Culbert was busy emptying drawers and tying loose ends early this week as he prepared to move out of his office in Township Hall by today.

"I'm doing my job," said the outgoing supervisor. "I get paid until noon Thursday, and I'll be in."

At noon today, Culbert joins the ranks of Canton's last two supervisors, who were ousted from office after one term. He narrowly was defeated in the Nov. 4 election by Republican James Poole, a 1972-76 Canton trustee.

As he packed up his belongings early this week, Culbert shrugged off concerns about his future.

"I'm young," said the 34-year-old attorney. "I've had some offers (from law firms). But I'm just waiting for awhile. I'm going to take some time off."

Culbert doesn't rule out the possibility of some type of government job. He cited a job offer from one governmental unit, but declined to specify details.

"But I don't think I'll ever run at

the local level again. I think it only has a future as a stepping stone."

On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, however, Culbert was immersed in the tiny details of leaving a local governmental office.

He wrote briefs to members of the new board to fill them in on ongoing projects.

He resigned from a number of local and regional commissions, such as the Canton Economic Development Corp., the Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments (SEM-COG), the Michigan Township Asso-

ciation and the Wayne County Solid Waste Disposal Planning Committee.

"In my opinion, (those memberships) come with the territory of supervisor," he said.

Above all, Culbert pledged to leave files in his office behind for incoming Supervisor Poole.

In 1978, Culbert accused his predecessor — former Supervisor Harold Stein — of taking township files, a charge which Stein vehemently denied.

Poole makes last try for boulevard

Incoming Supervisor James Poole made a last-ditch effort Tuesday to convince the state that a boulevard should be installed on Ford Road.

But Poole, who takes office at noon today (Thursday), admits that his efforts probably failed.

Poole and planner Jim Kosteva met Tuesday with representatives of the Michigan Department of Transportation to continue the township's five-

year-old lobbying effort for a boulevard on Ford between Sheldon and Haggerty roads.

The department's transportation committee was expected Wednesday to make a final decision on Ford Road improvements, which are tentatively scheduled for 1982 and 1983. The department's staff has recommended five-lane improvements for that stretch of Ford.

Poole is the fourth township supervisor who has lobbied for a boulevard on Ford. His efforts follow those of former Supervisors Noel Culbert, Harold Stein and Robert Greenstein.

"I think it's safer. And it's certainly a lot better to look at," said Poole, echoing the beliefs of his predecessors.

"IT WAS JUST something I wanted

to pursue. I felt as long as there was a chance (for a boulevard), I'd take it."

"It amounts to money," he said, referring to the state's decision.

Cost figures compiled in 1979 estimate the price tag for five-lane improvements at \$1.2 million. The cost of a boulevard with a 204-foot right-of-

Traffic lights proposed

Traffic lights may be installed at two of the most aggravating intersections in Canton Township under a tentative agreement between outgoing Supervisor Noel Culbert and the Wayne County Road Commission (WCRC).

The plan calls for the installation of lights at Warren and Sheldon roads and at Warren and Lilley roads. Culbert said motorists have complained vehemently about long waits at both intersections, which now are marked by flashing signals.

Under the plan outlined by Culbert, Canton Township would pay half the

cost — or about \$20,000 — for installation of both lights. The WCRC would pick up the remaining amount.

Culbert, who leaves office at noon today, has placed the issue on the first meeting agenda of the new board. The new governing body will hold its first regular meeting at 7 p.m. Tuesday in Township Hall.

"I didn't put it on last week's agenda, because I thought the new board should handle it," Culbert said.

He views the lights as his "legacy to the citizens of Canton Township."

Goulash flavors the melting pot in Winkel home

This article is one of a series profiling the varied ethnic heritage of Canton Township residents.

Shirley Winkel can close her eyes and hear the plaintive violin melodies which her Hungarian-born father loved so much.

She recalls the Hungarian folk dance which her parents enjoyed. And the next thing you know, Mrs. Winkel is in the spacious kitchen of her Canton Township home, whipping up a savory goulash to delight her family.

Mrs. Winkel is modest. She laughed when her husband Arthur, Canton Township's fire inspector, responded to a "census" questionnaire in the Observer which asked residents to share their ethnic customs.

"WHAT'S so significant about having a Hungarian wife?" wondered Mrs. Winkel. "I wasn't born in Hungary."

For Shirley Winkel, being of Hun-

garian descent pretty much boils down to change-of-pace cooking.

She buys large-sized cans of paprika, a spice extracted from mild, sweet peppers. Both paprika and sour cream are staples of Hungarian cuisine, says Mrs. Winkel.

Chicken paprika, goulash (thick beef stew) and flaky dessert nut rolls often appear on the menu at the Winkel household.

"I prepare Hungarian food quite often — it beats the run-of-the-mill stuff," said Mrs. Winkel. "It's nice food and there is no bother. It goes far. All (dishes) include two things — paprika and sour cream."

"Boy, they went nuts over her stuffed cabbage at church," interjected her husband. "Our kids go nuts over it."

AS DESCRIBED by her husband, Mrs. Winkel is a "full-blooded Hungarian." She grew up in Dearborn Township (now Dearborn Heights) as the youngest of five children.

State trooper layoffs may be next

While Wayne County Sheriff cuts face residents of western Wayne County, the services of the Michigan State Police here also are tenuous.

In Plymouth Township, both departments provide police protection for some 25,000 people, and both are facing cutbacks in patrol.

This area is served through the Northville State Police Post, which reaches north to Novi and as far south as Canton Township. What impact Gov. Milliken's proposed cutback of 126 troopers will have on Plymouth Township isn't known.

According to a representative of the Office of Management and Budget, Dave Lahman, cutbacks are not expected to be finalized until after the passage of the 1981 state budget.

Meanwhile, state fiscal officers have been meeting with representatives of the state Troopers Association in Lansing this week to reach some compromise on the proposed layoffs.

At least 15 percent of the state police so far have agreed to a deferred com-

pensation plan. According to Lahman, that plan calls for working an 80-hour two-week period of which only 76 hours would be paid for. The balance, four hours, would be paid for at a later date or "cashed in" for time off.

"ANY SAVINGS generated from this voluntary pay reduction could be used to reduce or eliminate the number of troopers laid off," said Lahman, who works on the planning of the state police budget.

"We've calculated that if everyone in the department executed this plan it would give enough of a savings that the layoffs wouldn't occur."

Gordon Gotts, president of the state troopers union, said his union would recommend that all state troopers, (2,150 as of Nov. 1), agree to this to avert the governor's proposed layoffs.

At the same time, however, he said the union wants to work with state fiscal planners on other cost-cutting measures that reach higher than the reduction of troopers.

"Do all the jobs have to come off the bottom? In return for the voluntary pay reductions we'd like to take a look

at the state budget for the possible removal of some sophisticated programs that aren't fruitful at bare bones strength, such as crime prevention."

Specifically, Gotts is talking about the removal of some administrative positions so that his membership does not field the bulk of the cutbacks.

The perimeters of those talks were established Tuesday at meetings with state fiscal planners, he said.

Lt. Francisco Dion, second in command at the Northville Post, believes the action of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners and its effect on the sheriff's patrol has had an impact on talks to reduce the state force.

"I don't see how it couldn't have a bearing on the state police."

He, however, has received no notice on the proposed layoffs impact on the Northville Post. "We expect to hear in a couple of weeks as to where the cuts will be made but we have no breakdown yet."

The post's staffing was reduced by five troopers in October, in an earlier statewide cutback. The post, once with more than 80 officers, is down to 41 troopers. At that time 80 troopers were cut statewide.

"We have long passed the point of making easy cuts," said Milliken Nov. 12. "When we began laying off state police troopers or cutting back on some inspection programs or reducing the number of personnel in our mental health facilities, we are beyond fat and into bone."

DESPITE THE governor's proposed reduction in the state police force, the 1981 proposed budget is still a 7.6 percent increase in spending over last year's police budget.

In fiscal 1980 (ending Sept. 30) the budget was at \$109.6 million and the proposed 1981 spending plan is at \$117.9 million.

According to Gotts, layoffs aren't the sole factor in the drastic reduction of the state force in 1980-81. In 1980, some 156 troopers were lost to natural attrition in addition to the 80 laid off.

This year, the union projects another 90 officers lost to attrition. In total, that leaves 450 (including those cut recently) which the union eventually wants replaced.

"Our ultimate goal is to replace those some 400 officers but we recognize that that's far down the road."

New board poises for dive into jobs

Padgett said he also hopes the meeting helps develop "a team approach" among members of the new board. "That doesn't mean we'll always agree with each other," he said. "But we don't need dissension."

"He played Hungarian records," she

added. "Always violin, either very crying or peppy."

"You have to realize it's hard for her to follow the traditions," added Winkel. "By the time she was 10 (her parents were) in their 50s."

Winkel, 46, met his wife when they were youngsters.

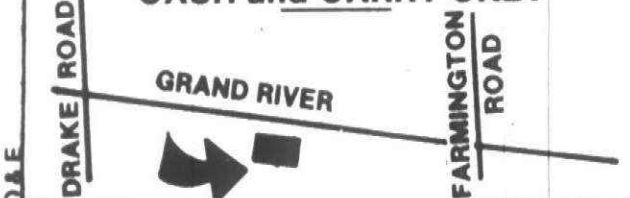

County cuts road patrol, expects legal fight

By TOM LONERGAN

The future services of the sheriff's department in western Wayne County will be decided in court.

Three lawsuits are expected to be filed in response to the county Board of Commissioners' action this week to eliminate the sheriff's Patrol and Investigation Division.

The division includes the road patrol, which polices Hines Park, and contracted police services with Plymouth Township, Brownstown Township, Romulus and Metropolitan Airport.

THE COUNTY board Tuesday adopted a \$300.3 million 1981 budget which will take effect Dec. 1. The board funded the patrol and investigation division

only through Jan. 31 to comply with the 60-days' notice requirement in police contracts with the local communities and the road commission-operated airport.

More than 240 positions would be eliminated, leaving jail staffing and guards in circuit courtrooms as the sheriff's department's only functions.

But not all of the sheriff's employees who now work out of the patrol and investigation headquarters on Henry Ruff Road in Westland would lose their jobs. Some have contractual seniority protection.

Before anyone is laid off, the county will have to defend its decision in court. The sheriff's deputies and sergeants and lieutenants unions are expected to file suit, alleging that the

county board has violated their contracts.

"WE WILL go to court," said John Baier, president of deputies' Local 502.

"We have to. We feel they are violating our contract."

Dale Orth, a sergeant with the patrol and investigation division, said his union, which represents 84 sergeants, lieutenants and inspectors, is "anticipating" filing suit. He said an arbitrator ruled last summer that the county could lay off only for "lack of work, not lack of money."

He called the board's action, "a subtle way of sneaking around the corner

and attempting to solve the budget problem."

Sheriff William Lucas said last week he would also file suit. Lucas was unavailable for comment Tuesday.

off after it," said Carpenter. "He followed it but eventually lost it. It was last seen heading toward a swampy area near the C&O Roundhouse."

"It looked like a good size doe," added Carpenter. "All the jogger remembers is that it had a big white tail."

Investigators later checked the area, fearing the animal had been injured. Carpenter speculated that the deer,

who may have been rusted out of hiding by hunters or wild dogs, could have come from the Dehoco property near Five and Sheldon roads.

Dehoco administrator Bill Rucks said deer could live in the 1,000-acre site between Sheldon and Napier roads.

"There's still a lot of big thickets out here where we do see fox, raccoons, pheasant and deer. The last deer I saw

here was in late spring, early summer."

Meanwhile, at the roundhouse, near Pearl and Mill streets, C&O car clerk Bob Colyer saw the animal racing through the yard.

"She was in good shape when I saw her," he reported. "But I think the noise from the trucks pulling in here scared her. She just froze for a second and then headed out."

"She's a chunky one. Her shoulders stood as high as the hood of a late model Thunderbird."

Dave Arnold, in charge of deer programs for the wild life division of the Department of Natural Resources, responded to the question: What brings deer to town?

"Well, first of all, the hunters are out. Then they (deer) act kind of goofy at this time of year anyway. It's the breeding season and they tend to lose their sense of direction."

"We had one up here in Lansing two weeks ago. One jumped through the window at one of the high schools and broke its neck. It's the time of year. Their behavior changes."

In an unrelated incident last weekend, it was reported a deer was struck by a car on Chubb Road, north of Five Mile, in Washtenaw County.

way is estimated at \$2.3 million, according to Kosteva.

On Tuesday, the planner and Poole

made suggestions for a boulevard which could cut the state's cost estimates of \$2.3 million.

Kosteva suggested a boulevard with only a 160-foot right-of-way. Poole recommended a ribbon-thin boulevard in

the area which would be used as the center lane in the state's five-lane plan.

"I was trying to pursue what was already a lost cause. It's almost a dead issue," Poole said of state officials' response.

Stop-smoking clinic coming

Dr. Arthur Weaver has scheduled a stop smoking clinic next month for the Plymouth-Canton area.

The clinic will be Monday, Dec. 1 through Friday, Dec. 5 in Plymouth Canton High School, 46181 Joy Road just west of Canton Center Road in Canton.

Helping Dr. Weaver with the clinic will be John Swanson, a health education specialist. Each session will begin at 7:30 p.m.

DR. WEAVER, a cancer surgeon, will head a group of several professionals who will donate their services for the five-night seminar.

Weaver is an associate professor of surgery at Wayne State University and has gained a reputation throughout metropolitan Detroit and Michigan for his fight against smoking.

His stop smoking techniques have been popularized by television, radio and newspaper reports.

Weaver attributes the high success rate of the program to the combined attack on both the physiological and

psychological aspects of tobacco addiction.

Each of the five evenings will have lectures, audiovisuals and group interaction.

Every participant receives a personal "control" booklet with instructions and encouragement programmed for each day of the withdrawal program.

"Every aspect of living has become incorporated into the smoking habit," says Dr. Weaver, "and this seminar disentangles the smoker's entire life style."

"WE FIND that most smokers actually enjoy the week. My real pay comes when I see how grateful people are to be rid of the dirty habit."

The clinics as well as other programs on health and exercise — including seminars on vegetarianism, nutrition and weight control — are offered as a community service through Better Living Seminars.

There is no registration required for the stop smoking clinic. A donation will be asked the last night of the seminar to cover expenses.

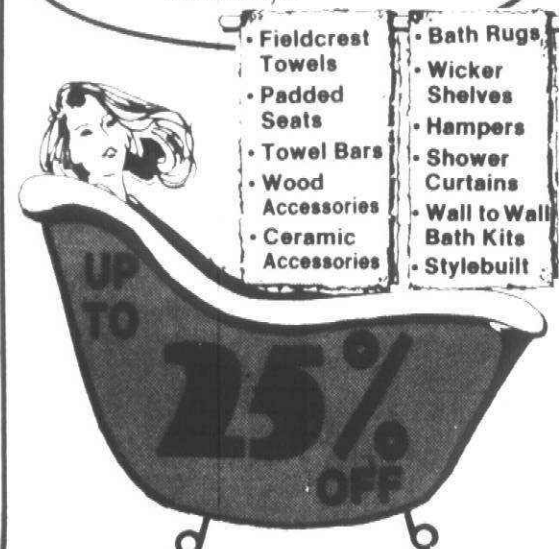

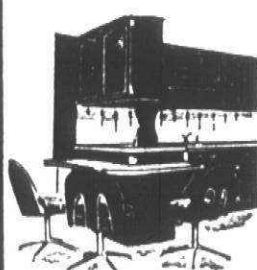

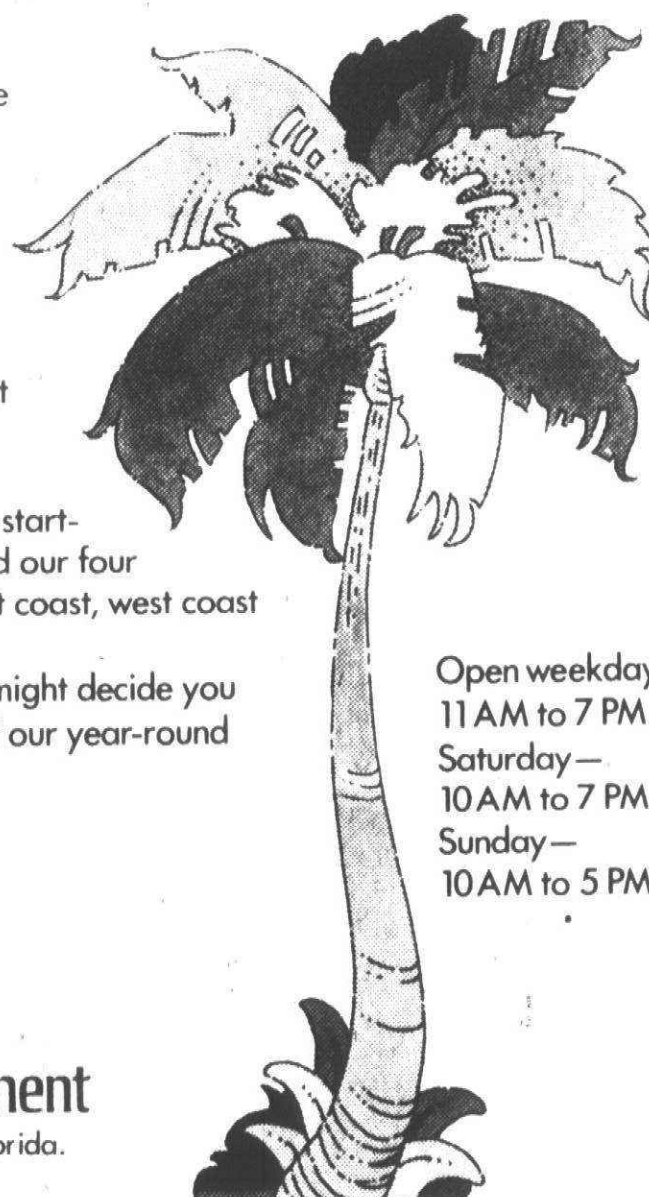

Despite pitfalls, old board got the job done

At noon today, the hands of Canton Township government changed once again.

Terms of four Township Board members — Supervisor Noel Culbert, Treasurer James Donahue, Trustee Robert Greenstein and Trustee Eugene Daley — expired as the clock struck 12.

At 12:01 p.m., the terms of four new officials — Supervisor James Poole, Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz, Trustee Robert Padgett and Trustee Loren Bennett — began. Clerk John Flodin, Trustee Carol Bodenmiller and Trustee Stephen Larson started another term in office.

IN SOME RESPECTS, the new Township Board will have a tough act to follow. We sometimes

disagreed with the old board's decisions. We criticized the infighting that sometimes occurred as well as the "unprofessional" treatment of some department heads and developers.

That board probably deserves a rating of eight on a scale of one to 10. Members studied the issues before coming to meetings and their opinions were a balanced lot. Members such as Mrs. Bodenmiller and Daley consistently voted according to their own minds.

Perhaps most important of all, the old board ran one of the most open governments in recent years. The credit for that must go to all seven members. They consistently made themselves available, no matter how controversial the issues at hand. They

answered questions, although their replies sometimes were spiked with rhetoric.

Outgoing Supervisor Culbert deserves special mention. For a democracy to work, open government is a must. Citizens deserve to know the plans and beliefs of their elected officials. As far as this newspaper can judge, Culbert's administration was one of the most open possible.

THE NEW BOARD should take a cue from the merits and shortcomings of its predecessors.

Thanks to voters, a well-qualified crew officially took office this afternoon. Their work will begin in earnest Friday following a ceremonial swearing-in scheduled for 7 p.m. today.

They will face many important issues, including a final decision on farmland preservation and ways to curb rising property tax bills.

Hopefully, they will address those problems with a minimum of political fights and a maximum of cooperation and level-headed thinking.

Hopefully, they will cast aside some bad habits of their predecessors and treat all petitioners before the Township Board with an equal degree of respect.

Hopefully, they will continue the tradition of open government in Canton Township.

The Observer wishes good luck to all outgoing Canton officials. We hope for a progressive four years to the new board which took over the reins of Canton government today.

More suits, less service from county

There was a grim comment on American society in action taken last week by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Keep in mind that the county legislators had already ordered layoffs at the jail, youth home, morgue and General Hospital.

Keep in mind, too, that only five years ago the Sheriff's Department had 1,200 employees, that it currently has 850 and that the board intends to cut that by another 250 or so.

And keep in mind that parts of Hines Park that were once grassy hills are now overgrown with weeds because there's too little money for maintenance.

IN THE MIDDLE of this budget crunch, the commissioners decided they had to add — add, mind you — nine lawyers in the civil counsel's office.

The reason is the increasing number of damage claims against the county generally and at the hospital in particular.

What it tells us is that people are lawsuit-happy. In slang, it's known as the "sue the bastards" mentality.

No longer do Americans seek their fortunes by panning for gold in California or Alaska. No longer do they seek instant fortune in the stock market, at the gaming tables or even the lottery.

Instead, they look for any reason to file suit.

This occurs at a time when Wayne County is losing population. It occurs at a time when the medical industry is ordering tests, tests, tests on patients for everything imaginable, just to avoid lawsuits.

MY NOTION of government, gleaned from textbooks and experience, is that a legislative body must make final budget decisions. We then live with those decisions, at least until the next election when we have the opportunity to throw the bums out.

The other county officeholders, and even the judges, have a different idea. They have a "sue the bastards" mentality, too.

Sheriff William Lucas last week said he would file suit to stop the cuts in his department. Lucas said he would hire a lawyer from "personal" funds, which may mean we are paying him too much.

A year ago, the county was going through this same budget crunch, and it led Commissioner Kay Beard, D-Inkster, to write:

"The courts are hurting us in many ways. Last year (1978), the Board of Commissioners asked all elected officials and department heads to voluntarily cut back their operations by 15 percent — whether through cuts in staff or programs was left up to them.

"The courts, the only ones in the county to have lump sum budgets, did not do so and knew that they would run out of money before the end of the current (1979) budget year.

"THE OTHER elected officials, except the Board of Auditors, sued us to regain their full appropriations.

"The court allowed them to spend at the full amount — which meant that they would also run out of funds — until such time as the suits would be settled.

"A recent (court) decision held that only the prosecutor and register of deeds would be harmed by the 15-percent cuts. However, that does not restore the money already expended by the others," said Commissioner Beard.

A FINAL ironic note: At the beginning, I noted the county is hiring nine more civil lawyers to handle the burden of lawsuits and claims.

If those lawyers didn't have to be hired, it would save the jobs of more than nine sheriff's deputies.

Thus, Sheriff Lucas' own "sue the bastards" mentality is part of the reason we will have less law enforcement protection in Wayne County.



Young adults spike drinks despite law

She sat there with her head dangling between her legs, oblivious to the crowds around her.

She looked about 18 — maybe 19 or even 20. She obviously had soaked up more cheap wine than football on that cold, gray afternoon in a college stadium.

"And they want to lower the drinking age to 19," mumbled a thirties-looking woman who stood next to me.

She obviously viewed the young woman as a graphic example of why 19-year-olds shouldn't drink.

But the remark struck me as totally irrelevant.

After all, the drunk and very sick young woman obviously was younger than 21, the legal drinking age, anyway. I reasoned that she'd be just as drunk if the drinking age were 19, 21 — or 30.

BUT APPARENTLY, the majority of Michigan voters view the situation from a different perspective. They crushed a ballot proposal Nov. 4 that would have lowered the drinking age to 19.

Like that 30-year-old woman in the crowd, they apparently believe that limiting the legal use of alcohol to those over 21 miraculously will buffer young adults from all the horrors of the world. No hangovers, no nausea and no traffic accidents involving young drunk drivers.

You might as well hope for a universal end to war.

A similar approach to the problems of drinking didn't work during the Prohibition Era, when alcohol use was illegal for everyone.

The reasons for passing the law were much the same as banning young adults from drinking today. People saw winos sleeping it off in the streets and

families disrupted by alcoholism. They saw heavy drinkers die young. So, they passed a law which they believed would improve society.

But people who thought the law silly simply brewed beer in their basements. They proved that you can't protect people against themselves.

I suspect that the 21-year-old drinking law will be just as ineffective in 1980.

The cold truth of the matter is that 19-year-olds no longer consider themselves children. They've already graduated from high school. They can vote, go to war, marry, apply for loans and even have kids before the magical age of 21.

Unlike high school kids only a few years younger, they're expected to begin mapping out a course for their lives in earnest. Many are on their own for the first time on some college campus. Others are working or scouring the streets for jobs.

Most consider drinking their right — no matter what the law says. If they don't want to drink they won't. But no law which they perceive as age discrimination will stop them from mixing a cocktail if they want one.

THAT CERTAINLY was the case on that recent Saturday afternoon when a young woman got very drunk at a football game.

That certainly was the case at another football game on another college campus 10 years ago, when the drinking age also was 21.

In this particular case, the drunk young woman was my roommate, Linda, age 19, who was a good student and usually quite rational and mature.

Linda went to a football game and drank a great deal of Ripple. Linda's parents drove up to East Lansing to take Linda out to dinner following the game.

But Linda was too drunk, too sick and too embarrassed to see them. She hid in the bathroom and made me — her loyal roommate — make up excuses on why their daughter wasn't around.

Linda didn't like being sick. I didn't like fabricating excuses. And her parents didn't like the fact that their daughter had "forgotten" their date.

But Linda, who later apologized to her parents, learned from the experience. She had abused alcohol — like many people both young and old. I never saw her that intoxicated again.

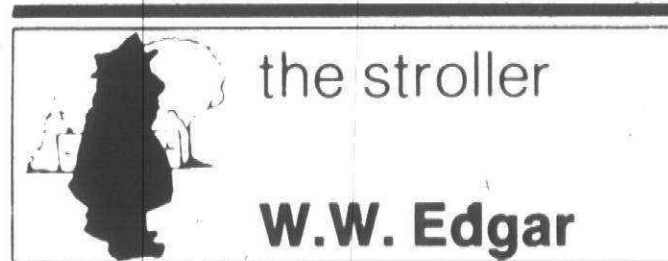
The point is that the 21-year-old drinking law didn't cap her bottle of Ripple.

But apparently, most voters view the problem differently.

Obviously, that 30-year-old woman who attended a football game last month couldn't recall similar experiences from her own young adult years.

She probably was too busy sipping peppermint schnapps in the "adult" section of the stadium to remember that alcohol potentially can harm anyone.

K.O. made big success as failure

He was quite a character — and one of the oddest ever to grace the rings around the country.

To The Stroller's knowledge, K.O. never won a big fight, yet he was booked in the main event in all the major boxing centers.

What made his career all the more unusual is that while he never won a major fight, he seldom finished one in any other position than on his knees in the center of the ring being counted out.

K.O. was what they called a "trial horse" in the fight game. Any time a young boxer with any promise came along, he was matched somewhere with K.O. And by beating him — as was the custom

— the rookie pugilist had his confidence built up for bigger game.

K.O. HIT the Detroit scene in the early '30s and soon become one of the favorites among the odd characters for which the fight game is noted. He was nothing more than human punching bag, but a smart one. He saw to it that he never was hurt in any of his bouts.

One of his queerest "fights" took place at the Michigan State Fair Grounds when he was matched with Primo Carnera, the "Ambling Alp" who went on from that bout to win the world heavyweight title.

Carnera was a giant of a man and the kind of an opponent who could be difficult to handle. But old K.O. didn't let this bother him. He came out for the second round and deliberately delivered a low blow and was ruled the loser on a foul.

Back in the dressing room, while the crowd hollered "fake," K.O. sat on a trunk and smilingly said, "Let them holler. My end of the purse was put in a bank in Windsor this afternoon."

Control 'zone system'

Current trends in photography seem to be toward more automation in cameras, lenses, strobes, etc. We no longer think.

What a "lift" it is when an area of photography comes along that enables us to put our minds in gear and fully control the situation. After all, creativity is what photography is all about.

Such an area in black and white photography is called the zone system. It was developed by Ansel Adams in the early 1940s. I don't believe an area in photography exists where more control, flexibility and creativity are at the disposal of the photographer than the zone system.

BASICALLY, the zone system is a way of seeing the world of color around us in values of black, white and gray and then placing these values, during exposure and development, in the most effective way. We then obtain the best possible negative and subsequently the optimum final print.

The zone system enables us to utilize one of the most important concepts in photography today... previsualization. This means planning the final print in the "mind's eye" before the shutter is released.

To understand the zone system, imagine a scale of 10 zones ranging from jet black through the gray values, and ending with pure white. Adams calls jet black (no detail whatsoever) zone 1 and pure white (again no detail) zone 9. All other zones would fit between these extremes. Graphically, the zones would appear as follows:

- Zone 0 — Blackest black that can be produced.
- Zone 1 — Almost black.
- Zone 2 — Very slight tonality.
- Zone 3 — First zone with noticeable detail.

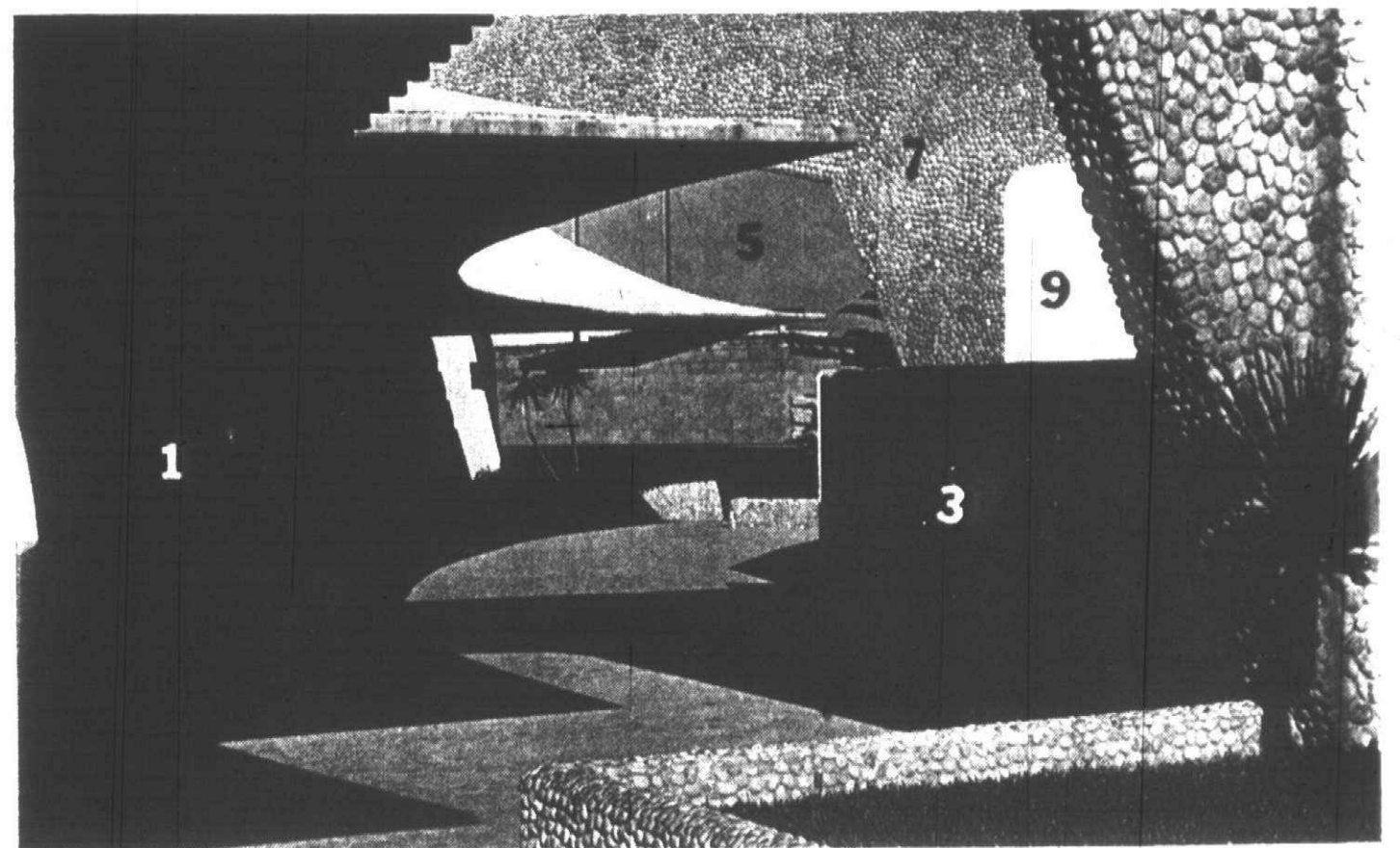
- Zone 4 — Very good detail.
- Zone 5 — Middle gray (all camera meters read this zone).
- Zone 6 — Very good detail.
- Zone 7 — Last zone with full texture.
- Zone 8 — Last trace of detail.
- Zone 9 — Whitest white that can be produced.

ZONE ARE directly related to F-stops. That is, any zone requires exactly twice as much exposure as the next lowest zone, anywhere in the zone scale.

Each zone equals one F-stop. All meters, either through-the-lens or hand-held, are calibrated to read resulting print of middle gray when printed normally. All other values will "fall" into their respective zones.

Of course, the zone system is much more than taking one meter reading (zone 5) and letting all other values end up where they will. There are many areas of creative refinements.

For example, average Caucasian skin falls into zone 6. So to produce an ideal negative and resulting portrait, take the meter reading off the skin (remember, always zone 5) and then increase exposure by one F-stop. This can be accomplished either by the aperture control or the shutter speed control. What has happened is that you have just "placed"

an ideal negative to make a print of which you'll be proud.

Dark subjects work just the opposite. Your neighbor's black cat should be metered as usual (zone 5) and then the camera "stopped down" to zone 3 in order to faithfully reproduce the cat's dark tones.

Are you beginning to understand the zone system? Can you see its creative potential?

the skin in zone 6 and a perfect negative is yours.

SUPPOSE YOU want to photograph your white cat.

If you did what the meter says, you would end up with a negative of a gray cat (always zone 5) and would find it difficult to produce a rich looking print highlighting the white tones of your cat.

Solution: Take the meter reading, keeping in mind it is always zone 5, and then "open-up" two F-stops to zone 7. Now snap the shutter and you'll have

is frightening when applied to nations. One retired general has gone so far as to say "a nuclear war would only carry us back to the level of living of the 1920s, and that is not so bad." Any school child knows the aftermath of nuclear war will not be that simple.

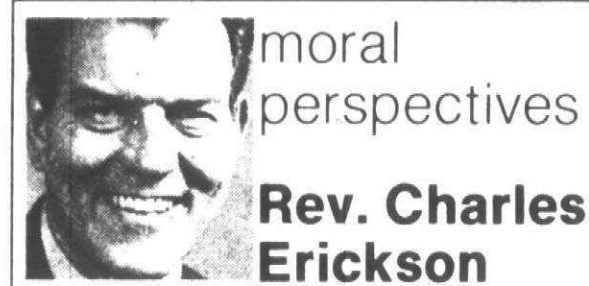
Measuring defense by "spending" is part of the naive notion that problems are solved by throwing money at them. Yes, money is needed, but the measure is how people and nations are involved with each other.

We need a will to do problem-solving together. We need a will to have a security based on mutual interests. We need a bond of fighting problems instead of each other.

A study of wars between major powers from 1861 to 1965 is astounding. It reveals that "dispute preceded by an arms race escalated to war 23 out of 28 times, while disputes not preceded by an arms race resulted in war only three out of 71 times."

The magnitude of proposed defense spending has a clear result: it builds a will for war.

THE PROBLEM of terrorism is similar. Our acceptance of horror is revealed in news, saying a group "claims responsibility for the bombing" instead of "accepts blame for the destruction."

'Will power' — want to fight or solve problems?

"Can't died 12 years ago," grandmother would retort when I resisted doing a chore. The number of "years ago" shifted with the years of my age.

She was called a "strong-willed person." I realize I haven't heard anyone called that for a long time.

Americans traditionally have assumed any problem can be solved by sheer grit, the energy of will power. Along with that, we have pointed moralistic fingers at anyone in trouble and denounced him for being weak-willed.

That has changed, rather gradually, with the birth and growth of academic psychology. By now it has filtered down to most of us that our actions are caused by a variety of energy sources in and around us. We do not accomplish everything we think we will do, and sometimes very little of it.

THESE DAYS we have a wiser view of ourselves and others.

We try to look at the whole person. We respect feelings as much as thoughts. We honor attitude as much as conviction. The old division of a person into body, mind, and heart has been pulled together. Many view the spirit as the crucial power in the whole person.

With our enthusiasm about wholeness, we need to be careful not to slight any part. Will, which used to be our only concern in morality, is being given too little regard.

A negative illustration clarifies. When we have the will to fight, sooner or later we pick a scrap and somebody calls our bluff. This

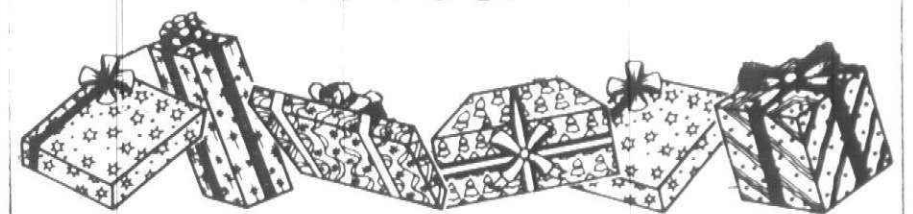

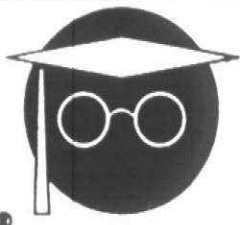

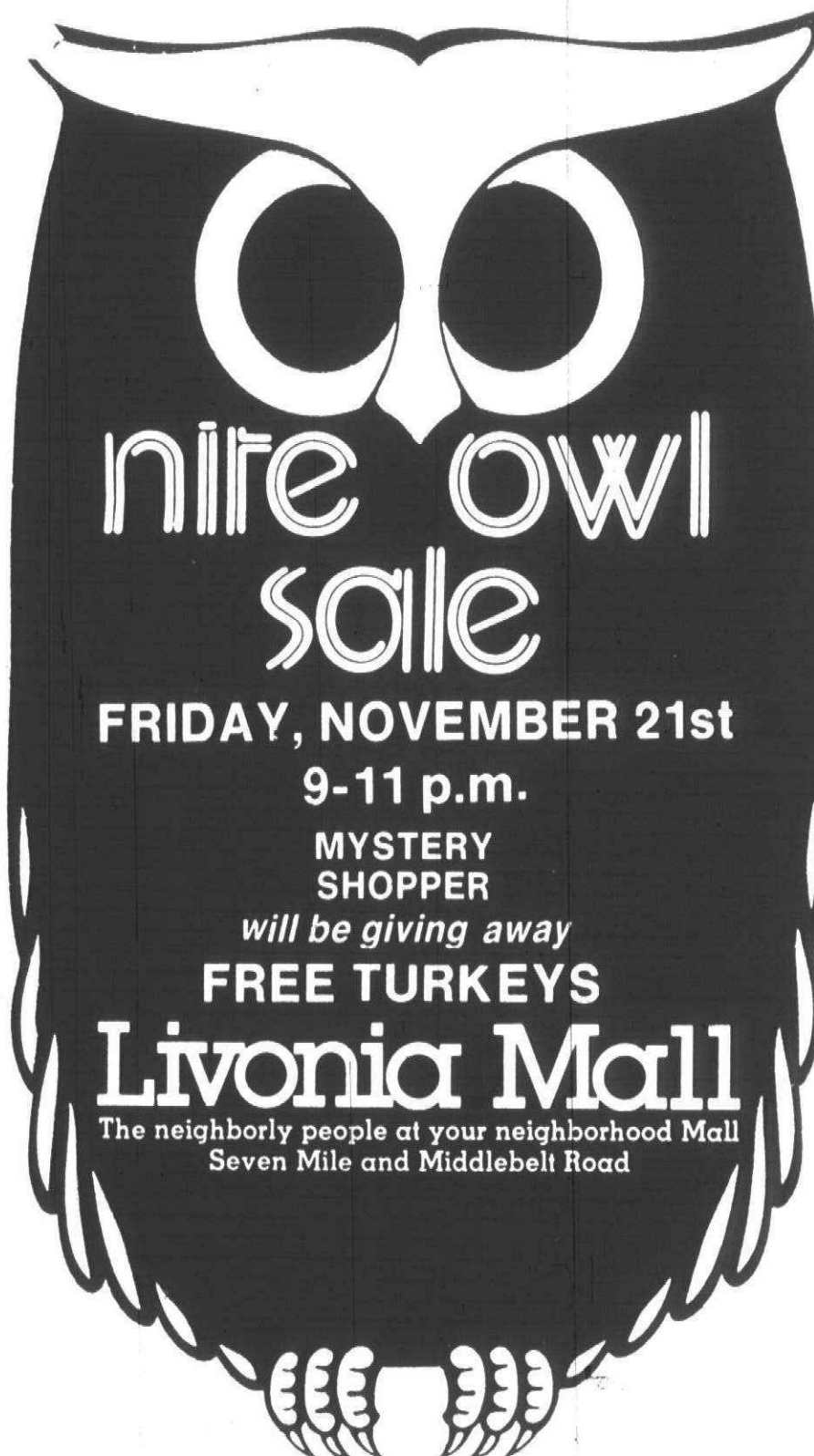

Farmington puts scare in Chief girls, 53-50

In the midst of a long winning streak, Plymouth Canton girls' basketball coach Mike McCauley was begging for stiff competition.

He got all he wanted Tuesday night as his Chiefs held off stubborn Farmington, 53-50, in a non-league finale for both teams.

"The end of the game was a close shave for the coach," joked McCauley afterward.

Canton finished its regular season with an 18-2 record. It was also the team's 17th consecutive win. McCauley's players celebrated the win by spraying shaving cream all over the gym. Since it was McCauley's birthday, he seemed to be the prime target.

"This is the worst shooting we've had from the foul line and out," said McCauley. "We seemed a little tight. Maybe we were too high for the game."

Farmington center Stacy Green was too high for the Chiefs. The 6-foot-3 junior blocked a dozen shots and led all scorers with 21 points.

She led a fourth quarter comeback along with freshman Mary Ann Kuhnlein, just called up from the junior varsity.

Canton blew a 13-point third quarter advantage as Farmington, refusing to

fold, came roaring back in the fourth quarter.

A short bank shot by Sue Carruthers with 2:18 remaining pulled Farmington to within one, 51-50.

The Falcons, who committed numerous turnovers in the first half, settled down in the final two periods to give Canton all it could handle.

Farmington had two chances to pull ahead in the final two minutes, but bad shot selection and costly mistakes enabled the Chiefs to hold on.

Pearly Cunningham and Jean Timlin, each whom paced Canton with 14 points each, hit crucial free throws down the stretch to put Farmington away.

"EARLY MISTAKES hurt us," said Farmington coach Bob Lekovich, whose team ended the year at 9-10. "I was pleased with our play. It was anybody's game in the last minute."

The Falcons were once again hampered by poor ball handling and passing for the first 20 minutes of play.

"Their press hurt us," said Lekovich. "It's been a problem. I told the girls we had to cut down on our turnovers. In the second half our guards we're bringing up better."

Farmington may have found it's solution to its problems with the press in Kuhnlein, who seemed to take charge in the fourth quarter. She tallied five of her eight points in the final quarter.

"We did a good job tonight," offered Lekovich. "Maybe we can gain some momentum from this loss."

The Falcons will open Class A district play at 8:30 p.m. against North Farmington at Northville. Livonia Stevenson and Farmington Our Lady of Mercy are also entered and favored to meet in the finals.

Meanwhile, Canton will tangle with rival Plymouth Salem (16-4) at 7:30 p.m. in district play at Salem.

Buikema explains principal views

I dropped by Canton principal Kent Buikema's office recently and came away impressed.

I quickly found out that Buikema, the head man since the school opened in 1972, is genuinely concerned about the sports scene off Canton Center Road.

He is more visible than the average high school principal. I've seen him regularly at a number of different sporting events.

"I suppose I have an interest," he said. "I enjoy being a spectator and a participant."

"I feel I owe it to the students and the coaches. I hope the people in drama and music feel the same way. It's hard to be everywhere because they're are so many things going on."

Buikema has officiated high school football "on and off" for the past 25 years. He worked on a crew of four with some "educational people" from the school district the past six years.

The Canton principal plays racquetball three times a week. He is also an avid downhill skier, knocks a golf ball around and plays tennis.

BUIKEMA HAS a good perspective on sports at the high school level. He calls it "co-curricular" activities instead of extracurricular.

The key to a successful program, ac-

coaching to Buikema, is stability in coaching staffs.

"Look at someone like Mike McCauley," said Buikema. "His girls' basketball program has done well. He's been the coach for a long time and his assistants have been with him awhile."

There hasn't been much stability in the football program, but Buikema feels that will change with new coach Richard Barr.

"Football limped along because of the turnover in assistants," he said. "Our football record (1-8) won-loss was not better than it's been, but the games were more respectable and showed potential."

Buikema feels programs in baseball with Fred Crissey, boys' basketball with Craig Bell, girls' tennis with Cyndi Burnstein, softball with Max Sommerville and cross country with Jim Hayes, are all examples of stable programs which are also respectable.

One program Buikema is concerned

about is boys' swimming.

"Bill Faunce worked very hard as our coach," said the Canton principal. "We didn't know Bill Hahn (the coach in 1979-80) was going to resign until late September."

"It put us in a bind because we could have hired in a new teacher for the fall with a background in swimming."

THE SITUATION has temporarily been remedied with the hiring of Plymouth Salem graduate Bill McCord.

Buikema would like to see school board policy change on hiring of new teachers.

"This is one thing that has always hurt us," he said. "Teachers and coaches we could hire are not given experience. They come in and are paid starting wages — the Step I level."

"The lower dollars are driven away. It's all an individual thing. There are some without experience that are exceptional."

Buikema is also concerned about sagging attendance at high school sporting events. He's talked to Athletic Director John Sandmann, assistant Paul Cummings and to various coaches about the problem.

"We have not drawn well," Buikema admits. "It's a shame the seasons don't overlap for instance like in basketball. I was thinking in terms of a girls-boys doubleheader."

"Maybe we could do more promotion. Maybe a gymnastics exhibition at the halftime of a basketball game. Or bringing in some little league teams."

"OUR PROGRAM is so vast, though, it's hard for them (Sandmann and Cummings) to keep up with that. Coaches have to worry about getting their teams ready."

Buikema said the community still looks at rival Salem as "Old Plymouth High School."

"The old sports enthusiasts still follow Salem, but I think that's diminishing," he said.

"I think our programs are close. I think it's on a par. Salem has been a winner, but we've competed favorably in a lot of sports. We'll continue to im-

THE LAKER WRESTLING staff brought in some key recruits for the 1980-81 season.

Three junior college transfers, Dan Yoder and Mike Cribbs from Muskegon CC, and Bill Kielts from Schoolcraft CC, should help balance the team according to Heaton.

"Between our veterans and our newcomers," he said, "we have been really working hard in practice."

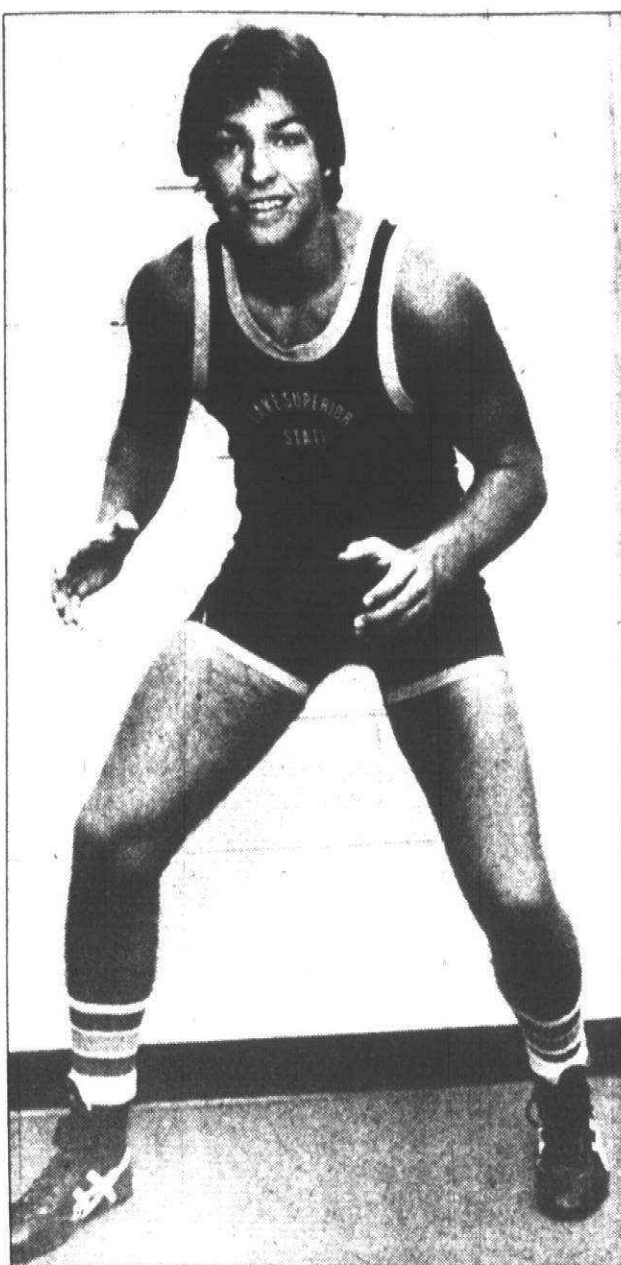
"The transfers really have added a spark to our workouts and the freshmen are learning quickly."

Heaton predicts Ferris State and Grand Valley State as the Lakers' chief competition for the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) title.

The big thrill came last Saturday when the Wolverines, using a six-man defensive backfield, stretched Purdue's string of scoreless quarters to 14.

Now it is on to Columbus and, given a break or two along the way, it could be a trip to the Rose Bowl.

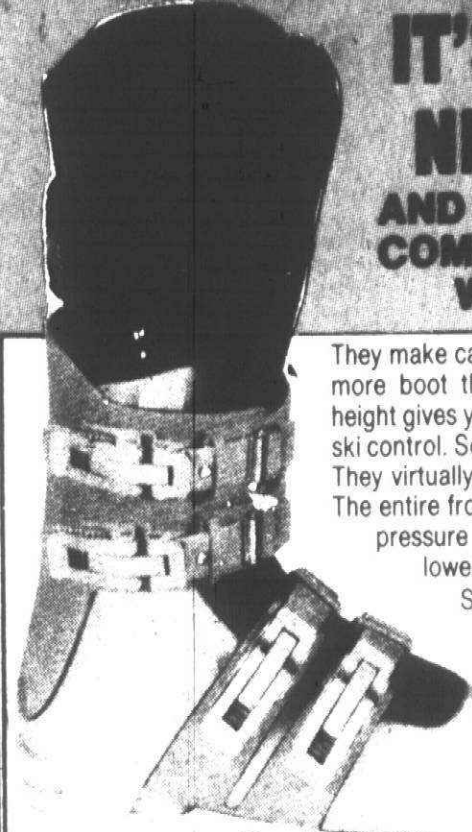

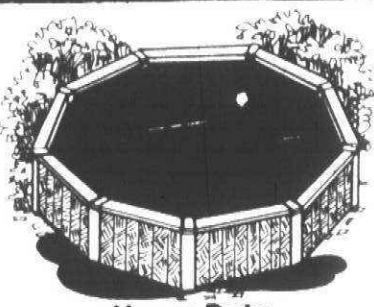

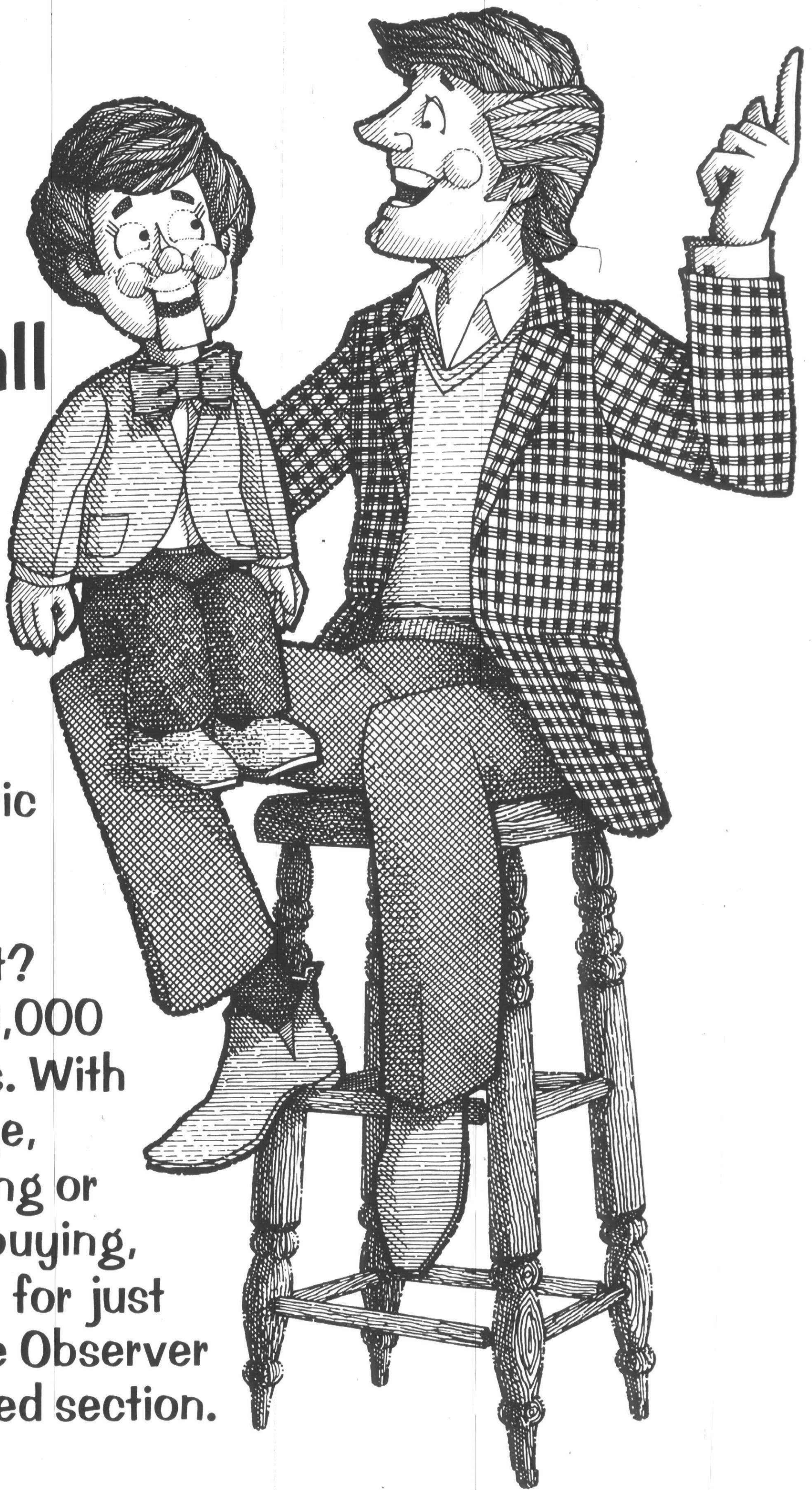

His poetry had my mind going around in circles. Was it Stephen Benet? No. Robert Frost? No. At the conclusion of the party he said it was former Plymouth resident, Max Ellison.

The dinner and program were arranged by Legionnaire Chuck Orr, who was unable to attend.

Rain runoff: a pollution problem

Rain water refreshes the oil and the soil. But as it runs off the land, buildings, parking lots and streets, it carries pollutants into streams, rivers and lakes.

This situation was troubling water experts who met recently at Schoolcraft College to immerse themselves in stormwater management problems. It is a topic that several years ago may have been expected to draw 10-20 people to a meeting.

But today with reports of contaminated water in this area, plus awareness that water gets so full of sand, dirt or fertilizer and other substances that water quality is altered, the conference attracted close to 200 participants.

Among those on hand were G.E. Siemert, city engineer of Livonia; his assistant, Gary Clark; and Ken West, head of Plymouth's building department. A delegation from Plymouth Township included Lee Fidge, township trustee; Thomas Hollis, water and sewer superintendent; Mike Bailey, township engineer; and Joe Attard, building department inspector.

The event was sponsored by the Michigan State University Institute of Water Research together with the Rouge River Watershed Council, whose headquarters are in Livonia. Also involved was the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) and the Office of Research and Technology.

SPEECHES REFLECTED a new wave in thinking about water management.

"Historically, the engineering approach to storm water management has been to get the water off the streets and into the nearest stream or lake as fast as possible with little regard to the impact of this runoff on the receiving water."

These were the opening remarks of John Eastman, assistant professor of the department of civil and sanitary engineering at Michigan State University.

"In the modern era, this blind approach is no longer acceptable," he continued. "Pollutants carried by stormwater can severely degrade water quality. In some cases, stormwater pollutants may be the major causes of low water quality."

Eastman and the speakers who followed laid the blame for these pollutants on a variety of sources. As it hurries toward the storm drains, water picks up chemicals used to kill weeds and pests, and it sweeps up salt laid down for ice control.

It pulls with it oil dropped by millions of vehicles, or poured down the nearest drain by a home mechanic. Leaves, animal droppings, phosphates in detergents and fertilizers flows into rivers and lakes where they permit algae to grow. This chokes the water and causes most fish to leave.

The residue of Michigan rich industrial life also can be carried into the water system as toxic wastes. Air pollution settling down can produce problems such as acid rain.

IN HIS REPORT W. David Morrison Jr., environmental planner with SEMCOG, indicated that his organization had found "evidence that urban storm water was a major pollutant source in southeast Michigan."

He also mentioned to studies being done in the area that could be the first steps toward dealing with stormwater runoff generally and its pollutants in particular. One of these projects is in Oakland County, the other in Ann Arbor. Both are part of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Nationwide Urban Runoff Program (NURP).

The projects are examining both the quantity and the quality of this runoff "to develop integrated, comprehensive, and more easily implementable stormwater management strategies," Morrison pointed out.

The project aims to develop effective management strategies making use of management policies that have proved effective in southeast Michigan and other parts of the country. Morrison pointed out that policies being tested included techniques for street sweeping, catchbasin cleaning, wetland treatment and stormwater retention and detention.

Street sweepers can catch pollutants before they get into the water supply. Cities like Garden City and Livonia make use of these machines that put the material left on roads into hoppers and collect it. Wayne County also uses them on some roads under its jurisdiction.

Detention basins are also used in the area, more to prevent flooding than as pollution catchers. One was built in Livonia when it was recognized that development in the Laurel Park area would mean that rain water would no longer be able to soak into the vacant land.

According to Siemert, it was built to hold the runoff from

nearby Schoolcraft College, while the Laurel runoff made its way down the drains. He added that developers worked on the pond with the college biology department, which will study its effectiveness.

Plymouth Township also slows up its runoff with a detention pond in Township Park. Smaller ponds exist in several subdivisions throughout the area.

TO WATER experts, pollutants can mean anything that has a bad effect on water. This could refer to suspended solids like

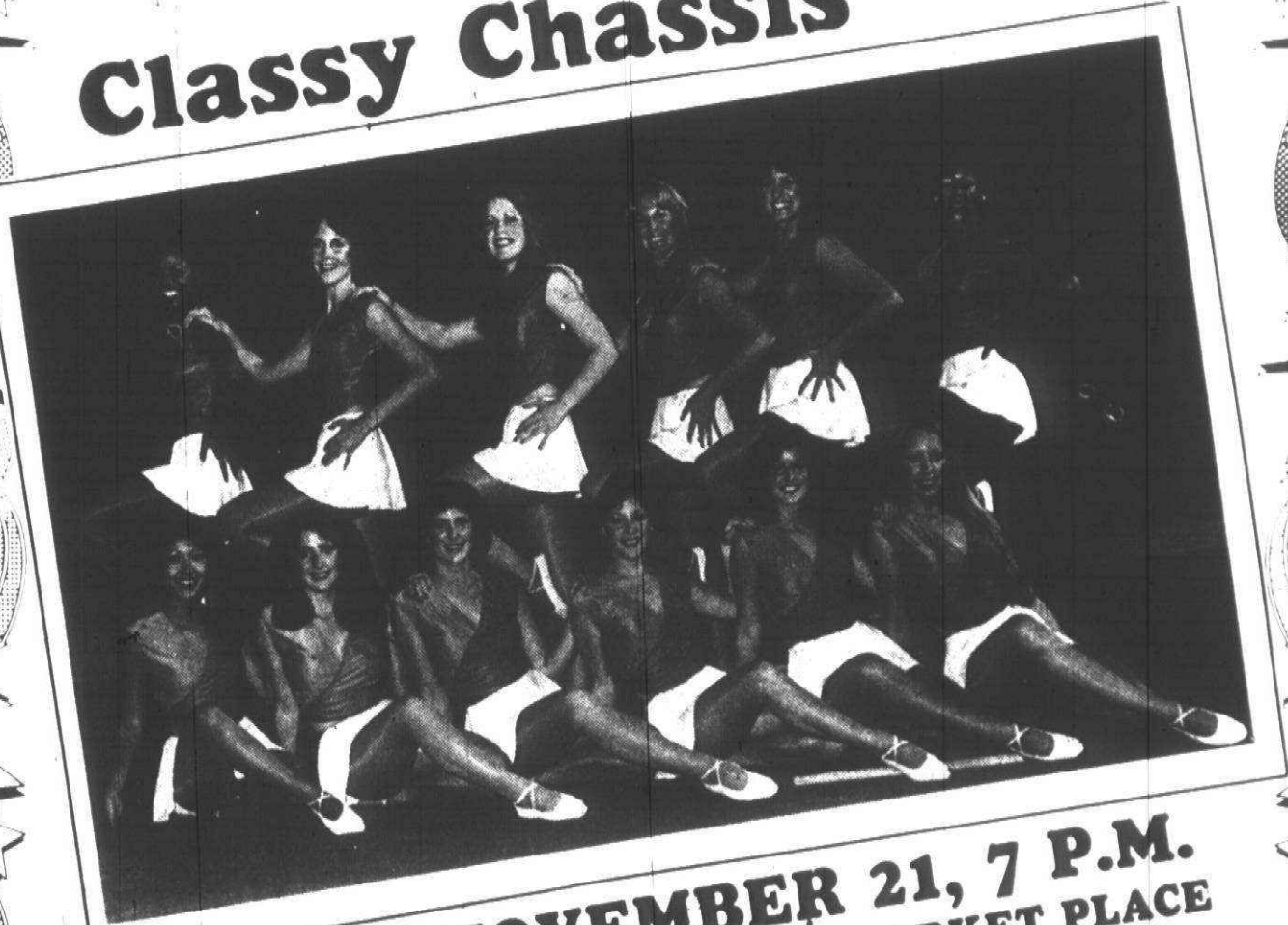
sand and clay that can smother fish eggs, or phosphates that cause algae to grow, as well as more toxic substances.

To the public pollutants often means toxic materials. Members of the public wonder what effect these pollutants are having on our drinking water.

In an interview, Henry Lane, chief of water treatment for Detroit, said that the condition of water is from 60-75 percent better now that it was 15 years ago.

The Detroit Water and Sewerage Department supplies the area with its drinking water from three points, one in Lake Huron near Port Huron, and the others in the Detroit River. One of these is near Belle Isle, the other in the downriver area.

In Lane's opinion, water users in this area are benefiting from the vast quantity of water in the Great Lakes system. Pollution is greatly diffused by the amount of water available.

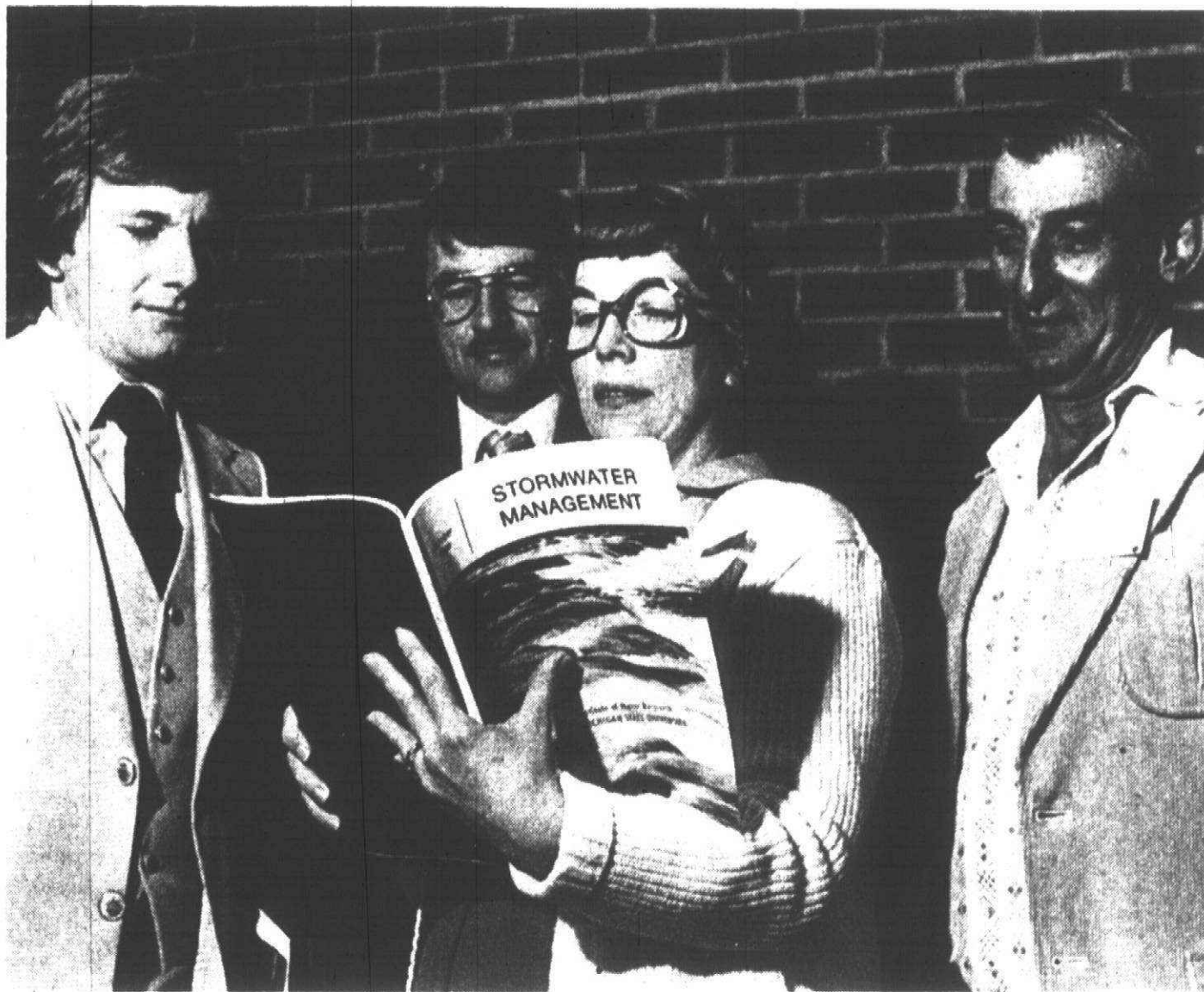
"We don't have problems in our raw water with heavy metals such as cadmium, lead, nickel or mercury," he added.

After the water is pulled from the

river and lake it is sent through a treatment plant before heading for area faucets.

A NEW THRUST in water management, according to several of the speakers at the Schoolcraft conference, is regional cooperation. Richard Carlisle underlines this point in his remarks. Head of the water planning department of an Ann Arbor consulting firm, he said, "Cooperation among local units of government is essential." He added:

"Recognizing no political boundaries, water flows across municipal, township and county lines. The proper management of watersheds requires communication and cooperation among affected governmental units."



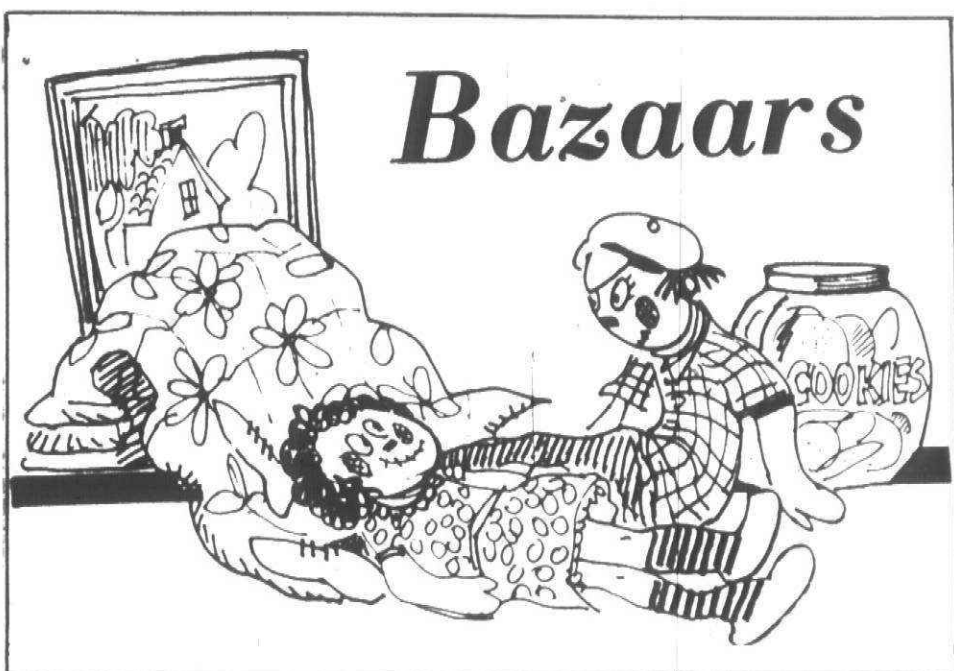

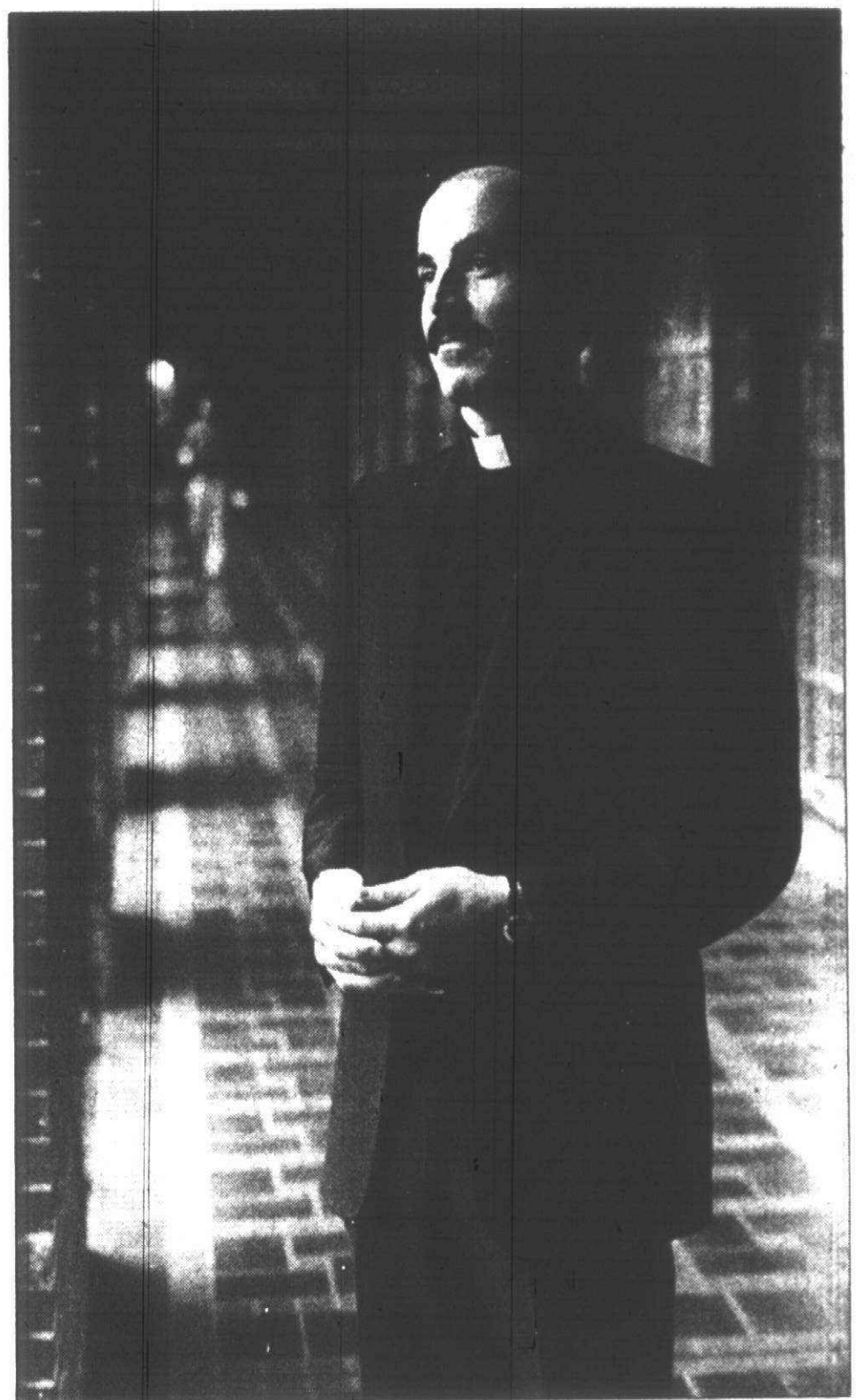

Seminary continues its 'youth movement'

St. John's Provincial Seminary, gracing the Plymouth landscape and serving all of Michigan's Catholic dioceses, is continuing its new tradition of young leadership for the priests and other students trained there.

The new head man for the seminary is the Rev. Robert H. Byrne, who is 33 years old and the youngest rector ever named there.

But he's only a bit younger than the Rev. Kenneth Untener, who was rector for three years before being named bishop of the Saginaw Diocese last month.

The appointment by Cardinal John Dearden was announced to the St. John faculty during a morning liturgy by the Rev. John J. Castelot, well-loved elder statesman of the faculty.

He pointed out that Fr. Byrne had come to the seminary from the Saginaw diocese and Fr. Untener was going there.

"Even exchange and no future draft choice," he quipped.

THE NEW RECTOR has been an assistant professor of moral theology at St. John's since September of 1978. He said he was surprised at the appointment by the cardinal.

"The bishops polled the faculty here," he noted. "The faculty was very supportive of me. They know me, and that's important when someone new takes over."

In his new role, he takes over leadership of a faculty that numbers 15 full-time members and 15 more who "come in to teach a course or two." He also heads a seminary with 163 full-time students, 76 men studying for the priesthood in the master of divinity program and 87 men and women in one of three other degree programs, master of divinity, theology and religious education.

There are more students, too, who take continuing education courses at the lavishly built seminary that was the great pride of the late Cardinal Edward Mooney.

ST. JOHN'S doesn't look as it did in years past, the tall, new rector with the ready smile allows. No doubt about it, there are less young men studying for the priesthood now.

"But last year," he noted, "the num-

ber of new seminarians in that program went up for the first time in a decade.

"And the enrollment in the other programs has gone up every year and keeps growing. The trend here, like in other institutions of learning, is toward older students. This year the average age of first year students is 29."

"We have many in second careers, and many who have been in business and decided to get more religious education. Some of them are older than I am."

One candidate for the priesthood, he noted, is a widower who was not able to be at the seminary during orientation week because he had to attend his son's wedding.

"One of the joys of our program is some of the people we have here," he said. "Those who come are ready to learn and share what they already have learned. They are a great asset."

FR. BYRNE grew up in the town of Chesaning and attended St. Paul Seminary in Saginaw. "I was there for six years," he noted, "and the rector was Fr. James Hickey, now Archbishop of Washington. Later when I was a student at the North American College in Rome he was the rector there."

"When I called him to tell him about my appointment, he said he felt a little like a new grandfather."

Fr. Byrne served as deacon in Zilwaukee, and later was pastor of St. Stanislaus of Bay City before receiving his appointment to the St. John's faculty.

He has taught fundamental moral theology, theology of marriage and medical ethics, and will continue to teach a few classes in addition to his administrative work.

"But we're looking for a replacement on the faculty," he said.

In spare moments throughout his career as a priest, Fr. Byrne has included sports in his daily routine, and his time at St. John is no exception.

"I've both played and coached basketball and football," he said, "and here I've met several former classmates living in this area so we're getting together for some basketball each week in the seminary gymnasium."

The new rector also is looking forward to a musical first year — singing in the chorus of Handel's "Messiah" with the University of Michigan Choral Union.

Later he served for two years as youth director for the Riverdale Church of Christ in Dayton, Ohio. He and his wife, Jacque, have two daughters, Alanna, 7, and Talitha, 4.

Not superior, but the water's cleaner

I've heard that all of the Great Lakes except Lake Superior are polluted. Is that true?

G.W., Birmingham

All of the Great Lakes, including Lake Superior, are polluted to some degree.

Lake Superior, the largest of the Great Lakes, is also the cleanest. But it has been plagued by asbestos-like particles from taconite mining, which have gotten into drinking water in the western area of the lake and have caused communities there to install filtration plants, which previously were not required.

Lake Huron is the second cleanest, then Lake Michigan, Lake Ontario and finally Lake Erie, which is the shallowest and smallest of the Great Lakes.

Which uses more water — washing dishes by hand or using an automatic dishwasher?

It all depends on how each is used. The American Waterworks Association offers some figures.

It takes 30 gallons to wash dishes by hand the way most people do it. But if they are washed and rinsed in sink or pan, the amount can be cut to five gallons.

An automatic dishwasher run through its full cycle takes 16 gallons. But a conservation use, involving a short cycle, would use seven gallons.

Advisory council voices complaints

The development of a five-year state plan for services for citizens with developmental disabilities was recommended by the Citizens Advisory Council of Plymouth Center for Human Development.

Upset by what its members termed "shortness of vision," the council made the suggestion to the director of the state Department of Mental Health. It asked that the director charge the Michigan State Planning Council for Developmental Disabilities with responsibility for developing the plan.

In its statement, the council indicated that the plan should outline program

priorities. Included with the plan should be a dollar figure estimating its costs. This should be reviewed and approved by the Department of Management and Budget.

The director must then take the plan to the Legislature to secure commitment from it to appropriate necessary funds for priority services," said the statement.

"We request a progress report of this process within six months," it added.

The advisory council was formed shortly after cases of abuse and neglect were found in 1978 at Plymouth center which houses developmentally disabled

persons. Its members decided to communicate their concerns "about the shortcomings of state programming for the developmentally disabled to those persons in state government with direct responsibility for such programming."

In their statement council members said they were concerned that "instead of comprehensive, multi-year and strategic planning, state programs take on a tactical short range character." They added that this procedure makes "the financing of health and other care for the developmentally disabled a product of the local economy, the whim of the state Legislature and/or caprice of the

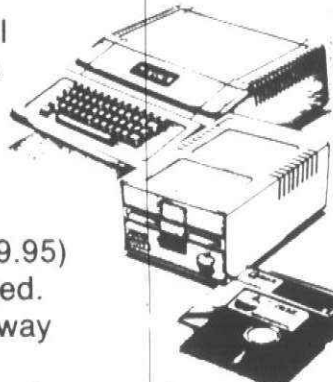
state's budgetary authorities." Priorities get destroyed in such a process, the statement added.

"We feel programming for the developmentally disabled should be done on a more financially stable basis," noted the statement. "Blowing hot and cold about mental health of operating in a feast or famine mode does a disservice to people with the above handicaps because it results in shortsightedness on the part of the Legislature and the Department of Mental Health."

The advisory council said the state's stop and start approach is "terrible inefficient."

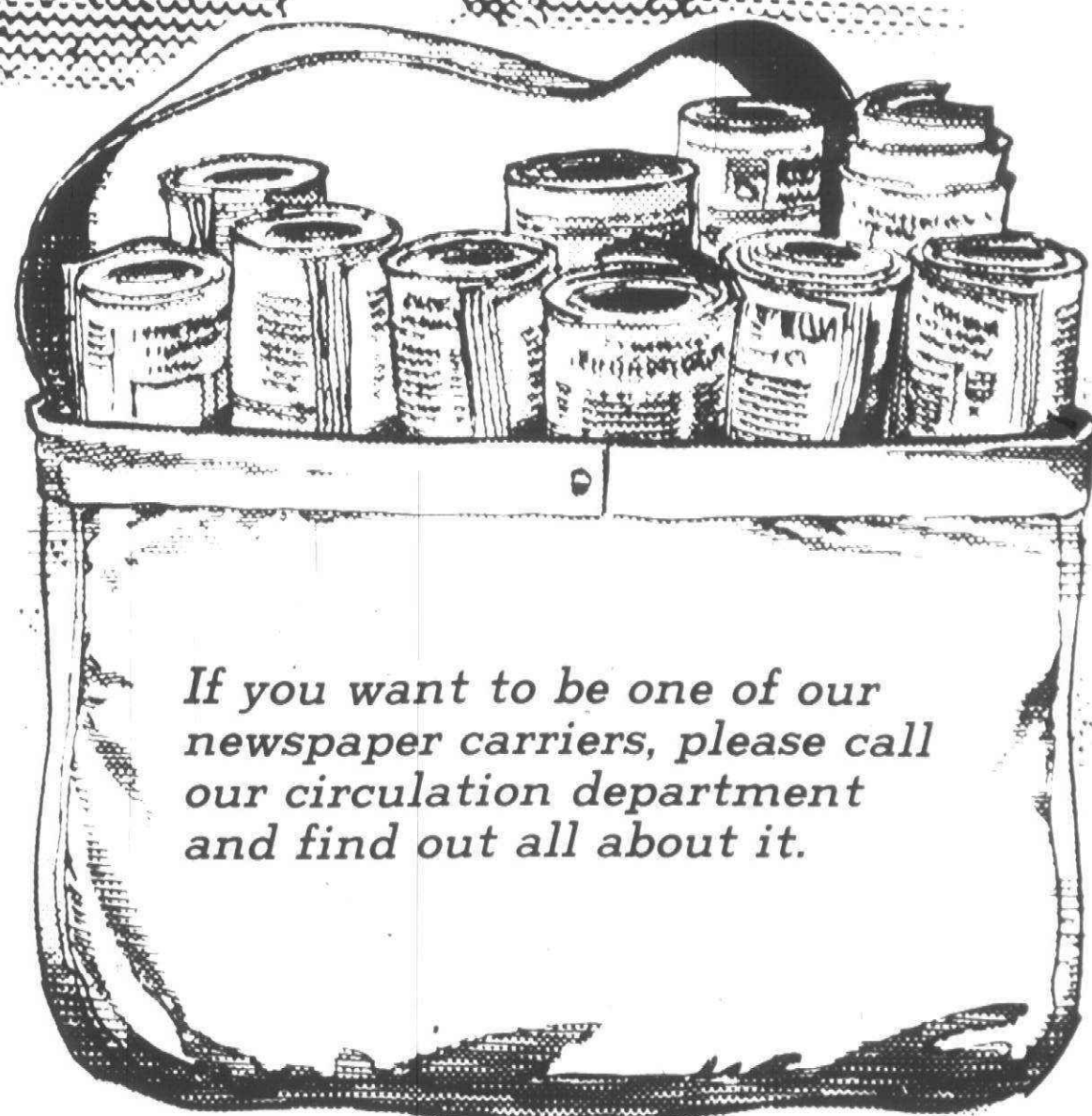

Diet dishes are packaged

I can't vouch for the flavor of the gourmet diet dishes chef Manfred Zettl creates. I haven't yet tasted them.

But now that I've heard this native of Austria tell about his work, you can be sure I will.

Unfortunately, it won't be fresh from his test kitchen in St. Louis. I will have to try them out unceremoniously in the Wonderland Center restaurant known as The Slimmery. Or I may look for them on grocery store shelves.

And even if the food turned out to fall short of my expectations, it wouldn't dim the pleasure of talking about diet cookery with a man who loves his profession and has excelled in it to the point of winning a number of gold medals.

Chef Zettl tells about cooking for President John F. Kennedy, Marilyn Monroe, Clark Gable, and themillions on the luxury liner, S.S. Rotterdam. And then he really warms up to describing his latest venture, creating gourmet diet foods, now being packaged under the brand, Slimmery.

ZETTL SAID most diet foods are nutritional but "blah."

"I have left the taste in," he said. "Many products are created where they are afraid to use salt and spices. They are afraid to offend, so things turn out at a blah level."

"And our products are designed for not only the weight conscious, but also diabetics, hypoglycemics and those with a cholesterol problem."

The secret, says the chef, is using less sugar, less fat and cooking foods at a lower temperature. He says he is concerned about the amount of fat and sugar in foods.

"Americans consume six times more fat and 10 times more sugar than they need, so I am fighting the battle on those two fronts," said Zettl, who used to weigh 25 pounds more than he does now. He said he realized that carrying around the extra weight was a strain on the body's organs.

"I used to go down to the kitchen at 9 a.m. and taste everything," he said. "Just by tasting I could consume a whole meal. Now it is low calories foods I am tasting." He has since lost the 25 pounds.

Zettl hasn't always cooked for the weight-conscious. "I used to fatten them up," he admitted. But in 1974 his sister learned she was a diabetic. "I became concerned about her, and it runs in the family."

While researching low-calorie foods, he also learned about nutrition. "Much of the sickness in this country is caused by poor nutrition," he said.

THE SECRET to his slimming-style cooking, he explained is in using less sugar and fat for two-thirds less calories. In addition, he uses a non-digestible carbohydrate, a kind of vegetable gum.

In creating a new recipe, he usually mulls it over for a long time but the actual first-time cooking process is quick.

"But I have baked a lot of bricks, too," he said. "There is a lot of trial and error."

One notable change on the international scene, which Zettl has observed, is that "even Europe thinks thin now." He explained that after the war, when food was suddenly available, Euro-

peans began to eat, and eat, and eat. "Suddenly they discovered how terrible they looked," he said.

One of his great thrills came recently when he saw Slimmery Frozen Dairy Dessert being served on a luxury ship from Holland.

"It gave me such a feeling to see my own creation being served there," he said.

Zettl is considering writing a cookbook, "Slim Gourmet Cooking Made Easy."

Does he have a food he craves, just can't do without?

"Well, I am very happy when I can have brie cheese and a good glass of wine," he said.

Theater guild tackles 'Shape of the World'

A slightly zany musical revue with the provocative title of "The Shape of the World" (Round on Weekdays, Square on Sunday) is the second offering of the season for the Theatre Guild of Livonia-Redford opening Friday, Nov. 21.

Choice of presenting this kind of a revue with the ensemble approach of four males and four females actually

originated three years ago when the guild presented "Piece of Eights" which they took to statewide competition. The success of the show wasn't the only one reason the guild decided to present this type of revue again.

Another reason was that there were so many good numbers they wanted to include in "Pieces" that had to be

dropped that the only alternative was to present another show using the same format.

"THE SHAPE of the World" contains 40 musical numbers from such diverse sources as "Stan Freeberg Presents the USA," "Best Little Whorehouse in Texas" and a variety of comedy and revue recordings.

Imagination sparks parties

Tom Schoenith revealed his and wife Diane's secrets of party-giving, last week at the Coffee & Conversation series at The Community House in Birmingham.

"Times are tough, but that doesn't mean you don't have to entertain. You can still do it with glamour," he said. Imagination more than money is called for, Schoenith said.

"I went to three steak-and-lobster dinners in a row last weekend. It was a little boring and it cost those people a lot of money. I'd rather have a great hamburger," he said.

Schoenith's illustrated talk began with slides showing ideas for party invitations, centerpieces and other creative touches.

"DON'T HESITATE to use things from around the house," he said. Paper plates were combined with Cartier baskets for decoration. Candles were set in the most inexpensive of candle holders: bright red, real apples.

One of the suggestions was to prepare a cold dinner in advance, gift wrap each meal individually and put it in the refrigerator till party time.

Clever invitations includes a firecracker made from a cardboard tube (Schoenith was born on the Fourth of July), or one shaped like a crystal ball ("Now that is a party you wouldn't miss!")

One slide read: "Our Pet Peeves. Lengthy cocktail parties. Ambiguous dress. Not enough importance given to RSVP. Don't get guests bombed." He recommends enclosing a stamped card for the RSVP.

After the slides, Schoenith took questions from the women in the audience, answering in his straightforward, amusing style.

What do you do about the guest who's late? "I serve that dinner without them. You cannot waste food," he said.

Casemore's partner Eric Jones said, "We encourage people to eat and drink during the show." Dinners will be served before and during the cabaret theater entertainment, offered Fridays and Saturdays beginning this weekend.

GONZO THEATRE, the new satirical revue supposedly about Detroit, is at its funniest when the show actually does talk about Detroit and its environs.

Familiar names and places bring laughs more easily than other material in this production, which opened the new Stouffer's Showcase (in the old Grogshop) at Northland Inn, Southfield.

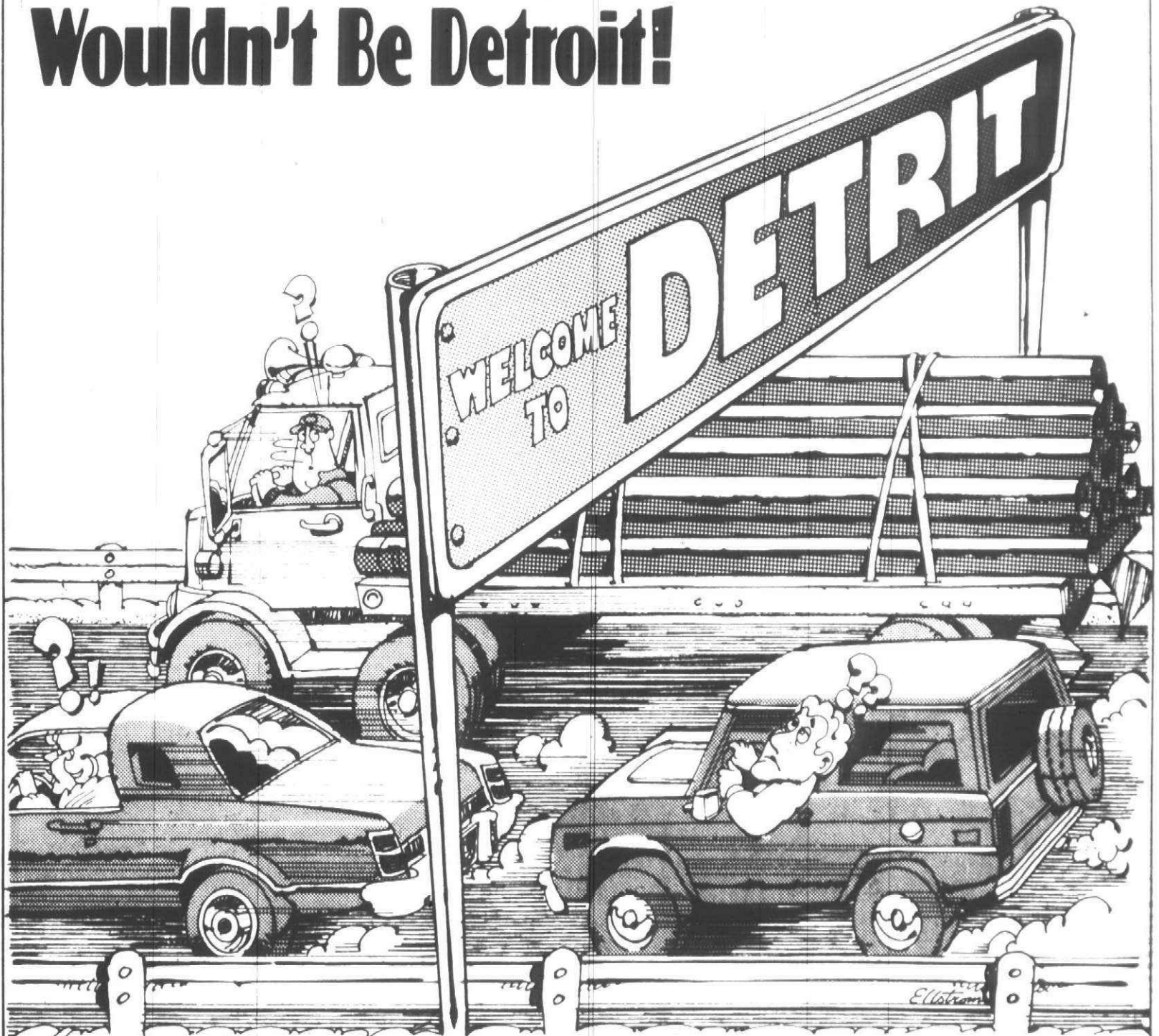
The cast is the best asset of Gonzo Theatre. The apparent leader of the clan, big, bespectacled Ralph Valatka; curly-topped, whimsical Beth Hall; and Hal Doyle, boyish with curls, and David Turrentine, boyish and blond, all perform with the prescribed zaniness.

But the material doesn't, in most cases, do them justice. Kind of a "Saturday Night Live," some of the bits are more tiresome than bold (such as the exhibitionist and voyeur who share facing apartments). Many blackouts go by so fast you feel like you're suffering jet lag.

● WHEN TO RUN

In this position, white rolls 4-6. What is your suggested play?

Sitting on your opponent's 1 point passively waiting for an opportunity to hit can be annoying, especially if he doesn't leave a checker open. Even if he leaves a shot, you must roll the correct number to hit.

The frustration of it all comes when he leaves a checker open and you miss it, then run around the board toward home to avoid a gammon, and lose the gammon because you were not fast (or lucky) enough.

Backgammon bear-off positions constantly change. Depending on the position, you need to judge when to stay or whether you should leave the 1 point.

If you find yourself staying on the 1 point for most of the bear-off, then running and being constantly gammoned, perhaps you should leave earlier.

On the other hand, if you run one checker out from the 1 point too early instead of hindering your opponent, you may be surrendering the 1 point prematurely.

The happy medium is this: When

your opponent is down to 10 checkers in the bear-off, you should make plans to depart one checker immediately, if you haven't already.

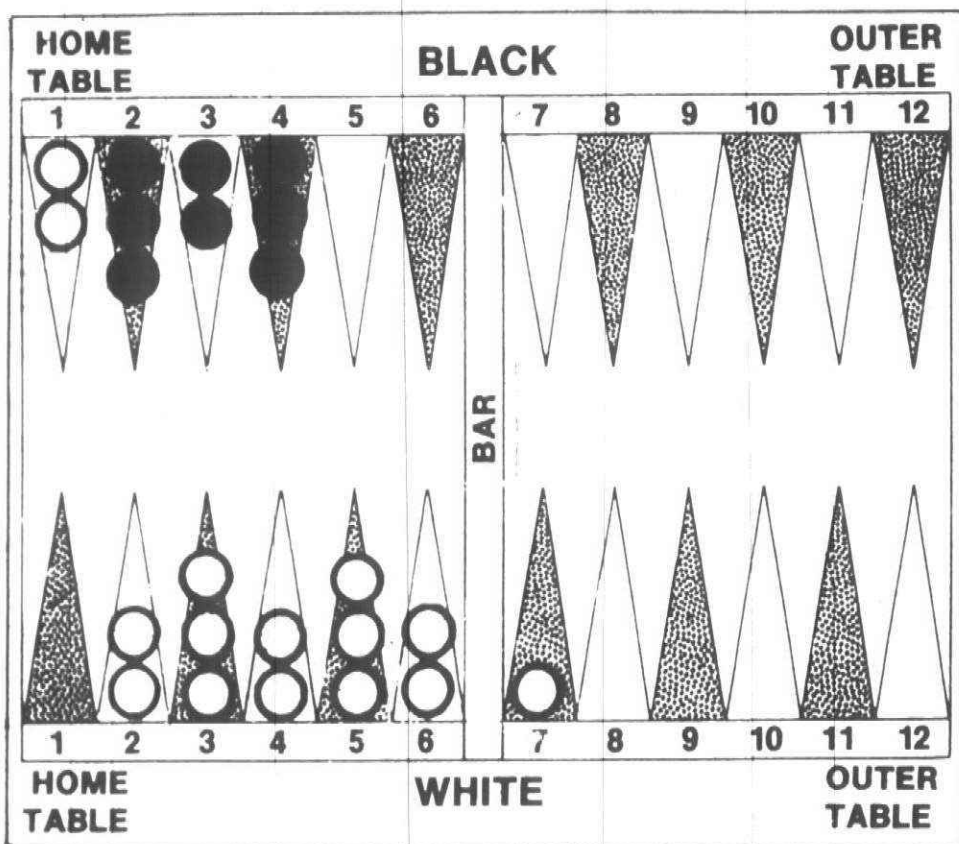
THE MOVE

If you haven't already guessed it, running a checker to the 10 point is eminent to salvage a gammon. In this position, black is a favorite to leave a shot whether or not you have one or two checkers on the 1 point.

Since bear-off positions constantly change with each roll of the dice, occasionally it would benefit you to stay back longer than necessary as long as your home board is intact.

Furthermore, if your home board is very weak, with several high points open, your hopes of containing a hit checker are nil — so run early.

"On the Waterfront" (1954), 8 p.m. today and 7 and 9 p.m. Friday at the Liberal Arts Theater, Schoolcraft College campus, free, phone 591-6400, ext. 380. Running time 108 minutes.

"Waterfront," the melodramatic tale of a longshoreman who battles valiantly to overcome the rule of a crooked union, collected all the marbles in the 1954 Oscar sweepstakes.

The entire cast is superb, and director Elia Kazan's deft handling of Marlon Brando made his Terry Malloy character a believable Everyman.

The screenplay should have followed Budd Schulberg's more cynical novel, which has rabble-rouser Malloy buried in a 50-gallon drum in a New Jersey swamp. But that would have been un-American in the cotton candy years of President Dwight D. Eisenhower. Brando, alas, emerges a hero and victor over the forces of evil in one classic, unforgettable scene in which he arises from a near-fatal beating to lead the sheep-like dockworkers in their rebellion against the likes of union president Johnny Friendly and his coterie of semiliterate thugs.

"Waterfront" came only a few years after the 1950s, highly publicized and oft-televized grilling of organized crime figures by the then-sensational Kefauver Crime Committee. The film seemed a dramatic and appealing extension of the Committee probe.

Compared with the goopy film concoctions pouring out of Hollywood in the '50s, "Waterfront" appeared as a bigger, more dramatic statement than it was.

Karl Malden co-stars as the priest, Lee J. Cobb is Johnny Friendly, the corrupt head of the union, and Rod Steiger — in one of his early roles — plays Brando's brother, Charley the Gent, the educated member of the gang who eventually atones for years of neglecting his brother's welfare. The memorable scene involving Brando and Steiger in the back seat of a cab — "I could have been somebody, Charley. I could have been a contender . . . instead of a bum" — alone is worth at least the price of admission.

"First and Last" could be the subtitle for the showing of these Alfred Hitchcock films. Although the British-born director made pictures before and after these films, together they represent his first and last great works.

"Knew Too Much" was made in England and it is not to be confused with Hitchcock's own, 1956 remake of the same film starring Jimmy Stewart and Doris Day, who, for some reason, sings "Que Sera Sera" throughout. The original film stars Peter Lorre, Edna Best and Leslie Banks.

A kidnapping and an attempted assassination are the spools around which the tension is wound in this initial display of the inimitable Hitchcock style. Eerie sets and off-center camera angles add to the suspense.

"Psycho" was recently remade by director Brian De Palma as "Dressed to Kill," though De Palma refuses to admit it. As usual, the original is by far the better. Janet Leigh, Anthony Perkins, Vera Miles and Martin Balsam star.

Watching "Psycho" is like sitting in a film class. Hitchcock does everything right. So, instead of even scratching the critical surface of the film at this time, here are a few tips on just sitting back and watching:

Look for all the references to birds in the film. People and cities have bird names, stuffed birds adorn walls, bird sounds accentuate the action and Tony Perkins actually looks like a bird from time to time.

If you've seen the film only once and know the deception on which it re-

volves, see the picture a second time. You'll be surprised by how un-deceiving and thinly veiled the plot device actually is.

Note the bit player who appears briefly near the end of the film. You'll recognize him today as a very successful TV comedy performer. Ratings: \$3.70.

'Boy Meets Girl' opens Hilberry season

"Wild Oats," "Love's Labor's Lost," "Macbeth," "Caesar and Cleopatra," "Love for Love," "Bloody Jack," and "Tonight at 8:30."

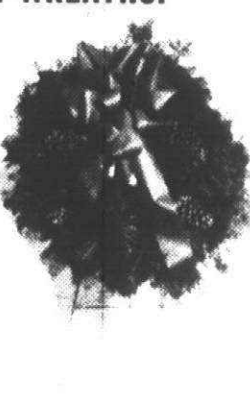

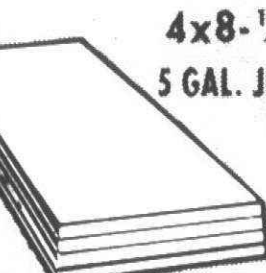

Jazz star Kenny Cox boosts musical endeavors

Kenny Cox is an articulate spokesman for jazz musicians in the metropolitan area. A smart dresser, he looks right at home at Tweeny's Cafe in Birmingham where he plays piano in a duo or trio setting on week-ends.

Cox has strong interests in the economics of music and clear insight into the finances of jazz. He advocates with verbal agility the music and the music business.

Cox is one of the founding members of M.U.S.I.C. (Musicians United to Save Indigenous Culture). Words like fragmentation, coalesce, self-determination and grantsmanship roll off his tongue.

"I'M VERY SERIOUS that all artists become professional business people," he said, in his clipped and quiet voice, during a recent nighttime interview.

Concerned about self-determination in the arts, Cox does not blame society as much as the individual artist for poor subsidies to the arts, especially to the musician.

"Our society gives very little merit to artistic endeavors and you need only compare the subsidies in this country with those in other countries to know this is true," he said. "We continue to decry how art is ignored and the artist economically depressed. But it boils down this: The artist must come to

grips with professionalism. The idea of being a martyr is unfair and outdated. The artist must become a businessman."

Cox has very little time for the artist or musician who wants the money but won't take the time to do the paperwork that goes with it. He would like to see all musicians receive a crash course in grantsmanship. But he has other plans up his sleeve.

"I THINK in the near future you will see one of the first quasi-trade associations ever in this area. The trade association will deal with musicians in terms of continuing education, health and welfare," he said.

The trade association would not replace the musicians' union. "There are unions for jazz musicians, but jazz musicians have some particular kinds of problems socially and politically other musicians and artists don't have," he said.

In addition to economic and social concerns, Kenny Cox happens to be one of the finer jazz pianists in the area. He has appeared Fridays and Saturdays at Tweeny's for more than a year. Cox will continue for a long time in the future, said Tweeny's owner Yvonne Gill.

The Cable-Nelson baby grand piano newly ensconced in the center of the downtown Birmingham restaurant suggests the class that is found in the cafe, from the food to the ambience to the entertainment.

"Very few rooms give as much time

and consideration to the music and the promotion," Cox said.

SOMETIMES the music, as in any restaurant, is secondary to the main business of feeding people elegantly. For Kenny Cox, this only presents an additional challenge. While he is willing to take requests, something which many jazz purists wouldn't think of doing, he is unyielding when it comes to the jazz he plays with his crisp, honed technique.

At times he is classical in his approach, but the swinging is never sacrificed, as he heats his way through a popular tune like "What Are You Doing the Rest of Your Life?" or a jazz standard such as "A Train."

In a bossa-nova standard like "Wave," the notes wash back on themselves much like the waves of an ocean, with regular bass player Melvin Jackson providing support that acts as foundation and counterpoint.

Cox's tunes are often elegantly worked-out versions that are long and lingering. Sometimes he doesn't want to let go of a number, and his style helps the casual listener feel the same way.

Cox's piano style is a product of the variegated jazz world of the Motor City of the late '40s, '50s and '60s. Despite a classical-piano background, Cox found jazz always hovered around his consciousness somewhere.

"I BEGAN PIANO at the age of 7, but I didn't want to be a piano player. I wanted to play the trumpet like Louis Armstrong and Harry James," he said. "My mother, for whatever reason, told me I could have a trumpet and even take trumpet lessons if I first took the piano for three years. I did and she kept her promise."

An insistent piano teacher, recognizing a young child with musical talent, had him study piano at the Detroit Con-

servatory of Music where he would remain for eight years. In addition, he also took trumpet lessons, although he doesn't really know how his mother managed both piano and trumpet lessons when there were three other children in the family.

His jazz, he said, was picked up in the streets at the time he was taking classical lessons. "I had this friend in junior high school who was a trumpet player. Before band rehearsals at school, he would stand around and play a style of music I hadn't heard before. He introduced me to the funny music being played at that time by Miles Davis and Charlie Parker," Cox said.

Playing along with his friend meant a trumpet duo, which wasn't very practical. "One day he suggested I play some chords on the piano. That started my instruction in the improvisational art form," Cox recalled.

Going on to Cass Tech High School, he was in the music curriculum. When

he finished in 1958 he immediately went on to the Detroit Institute of Musical Arts, the music college for the University of Detroit. He stayed in college for only a year, however.

"I GOT the bright idea I was going out on the road where I would make lots of money and then I could afford school. I never went back, and it seems like I've been on the road ever since," Cox said. Using New York as a base, he traveled with singer Etta Jones from 1961-66 as her accompanist.

Whenever he returned to New York City, though, he was able to work with some of the brightest lights in jazz of the '60s. He gigged with Philly Joe Jones, Roy Haynes, Joe Williams, Rahsaan Roland Kirk, Kenny Dorham and Freddie Hubbard, among others.

"New York was musical Mecca than," Cox said. "Those now-famous musicians were just the guy down the street."

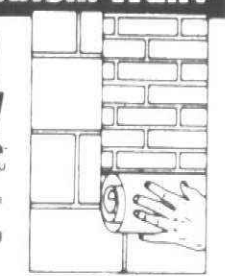
