State approves 5-lane Ford with bike path

Bicycle trails on the north side of Ford Road are included in plans of the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) for a five-lane widening project in 1983.

On Wednesday, the MDOT's Transportation Commission voted unanimously to give final approval to the plans.

The commission's decision coincides with a staff recommendation for a five-lane improvement project on Ford between Sheldon and Haggerty. It rejects a five-year lobbying effort of Canton Township officials for construction of a boulevard on that stretch of Ford.

Supervisor James Poole, who met with MDOT officials earlier last week, had expected defeat of the boulevard concept at Wednesday's meeting because of the higher cost.

THE STATE'S PLANS also call for construction of an eight-foot, paved bicycle path on the north side of Ford from Sheldon to Interstate 275. The state will utilize existing sidewalks while constructing the off-road trail.

Terry Eldred, an MDOT transportation planner, said the bike path will

connect with an existing trail which runs on the east side of I-275. The freeway path joins another bicycle trail in Edward Hines Park.

Guillaume Schins, a route location engineer for the MDOT, said some type of bicycle trails always were included in Ford Road widening plans.

But that portion of the plan received little publicity. Mike Gouin, superintendent of Canton's Parks and Recreation Department, said he was unaware of the bike trail proposal.

"We've seen them on the plans all along. It's something we expected," said assistant township planner Dave Nicholson. "That's probably why no one brought it up."

"After all, it's the Department of Transportation — not the Department of Highways. We anticipate (the trails) will make pedestrian movement much safer than now along Ford Road and encourage bicycle use."

ELDRED SAID the state routinely has considered bicycle path construction as part of highway widening projects since a 1973 state law made highway funds available for that use.

Bike paths also are included in a state plan to widen Ford from two to five lanes from I-275 to Venoy in Westland, he said. Implementation of the Westland widening project is scheduled for next spring.

Eldred said the existence of bike trails along I-275 contributed to the state's decision for paths on Ford. The Westland path will connect with a trail planned by the city behind the Westland Civic Center, he said.

"We feel people using the I-275 bike

paths will have a chance to get off at Ford Road and frequent some of the businesses along there," explained Schins. "I think it's a good location for paths. It will increase the use of the I-275 trails."

Original plans for bike paths along Ford Road in Canton called for construction of two six-foot-wide trails on the north and south side of the highway.

Eldred said the plans were amended to show one eight-foot-wide trail on the

north side of Ford as a cost-conserving measure.

Plans already approved for Ford Road widening in Westland call for bike paths on both sides of the highway. Schins said those plans also may be amended to show trails only on one side of Ford.

CANTON BICYCLISTS who live near Ford Road currently must ride on the shoulder of the highway in order to reach trails along I-275.

"The way it is right now, riding bikes along there is the worse thing in the world," said Gouin. "I-275 probably isn't used as much as people would like to, because they can't get to it."

Schins said the state will award the contract for the Ford Road widening and bike path construction in Canton in late 1982. Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 1983.

In 1979, the cost of a Ford Road boulevard was estimated at \$2.3 million.

Census appeal may fall short of 50,000 goal

Canton Township may have to conduct its own census within the next few years in order to qualify for millions of dollars in state and federal monies during the next decade.

A preliminary response to the township's appeal of last spring's federal census indicates that Canton will not reach the "magic" population figure of 50,000, said township grant coordinator Terry Carroll.

Tentative figures released by the U.S. Census Bureau in July pegged Canton's population at 47,977. Township officials quickly appealed the preliminary results in hopes of "finding" 2,023 more residents.

Proving a 50,000 population would qualify Canton for an additional \$15 to \$20 million in state and federal monies over the next decade, Carroll estimates. Communities of that size receive fatter shares of federal community block grant funds, more federal revenue sharing and increased eligibility for other kinds of grants.

TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS will not receive final census figures until next spring or summer.

But Carroll said that a recent communication from the U.S. Census Bureau "pretty well dashes" hopes to reach the 50,000 figure during the federal census process.

A preliminary revision of the original figures show that Canton has "picked up" only 383 residents as a result of the appeal. Revised figures peg Canton's population at 48,360 — still 1,640 short of the 50,000 figure.

Carroll guesses that the figure will not change substantially between now and mid-1981, when census results are finalized.

"I bet we'll be darn close to that 48,360 figure," he said.

"The letter (from the U.S. Census Bureau) wasn't detailed. It was just several short paragraphs, saying, 'Best of luck in the future. Your number is such and such.'"

"We're looking at a few things now, so when we think those extra 1,600 people move in, we'll do our own census," Carroll said.

HE ADMITS, however, that local head counts sometimes carry less weight than the federal census, conducted once every 10 years.

Carroll said many grant programs base eligibility on income, housing and other criteria in addition to population figures. Federal and state government sometimes reject statistics collected in a local census.

Revenue-sharing monies must be distributed on the basis of federal head counts. In Michigan, the governor retains the authority to recognize or reject population figures compiled in a local census for purposes of disbursing those funds.

This year, for example, Canton received an additional \$322,000 in state revenue-sharing monies because of a township census conducted in 1975. But finance director Mike Gorman expects that allocation to be cut next year as a result of Gov. William Milliken's budget-slashing proposal.

Canton conducted its own census in 1975 following the start of a home-construction boom in the early 70s.

In the 1970 federal census, predominantly rural Canton registered a population of only 11,000. That figure more than doubled during the next five years. A township-sponsored census in 1975 pegged Canton's population at 27,000.

TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS estimated Canton's population in excess of 50,000 prior to last spring's census work.

In 1978, the township reported more housing starts than any other community in southeast Michigan. The township placed second in terms of housing starts from 1974 to 1977.

Officials believe that Canton would have easily topped the 50,000 figure in the census if the home-construction boom had continued. But an economic downturn in mid-1979 caused housing starts to plummet.

Officials reported only 50 housing starts from January through October of this year. That compares to 1,577 housing starts in 1978, when Canton topped all other southeast Michigan communities in terms of home-construction activity.

Government switches hands

Canton Township has a new governing body.

Hundreds of residents showed up at Township Hall Thursday night to see Judge James Garber and Judge Dunbar Davis of the 35th District Court administer the oath of office.

The new officials — Supervisor James Poole, Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz, Clerk John Flodin and Trustees Carol Bodenmiller, Stephen Larson, Loren Bennett and Robert Padgett — will hold the reins of Canton government for the next four years.

A new state law makes the terms of all seven board members expire concurrently. Until recently, township supervisors, clerks and treasurers were elected to two-year terms, while trustees remained in office for four years.

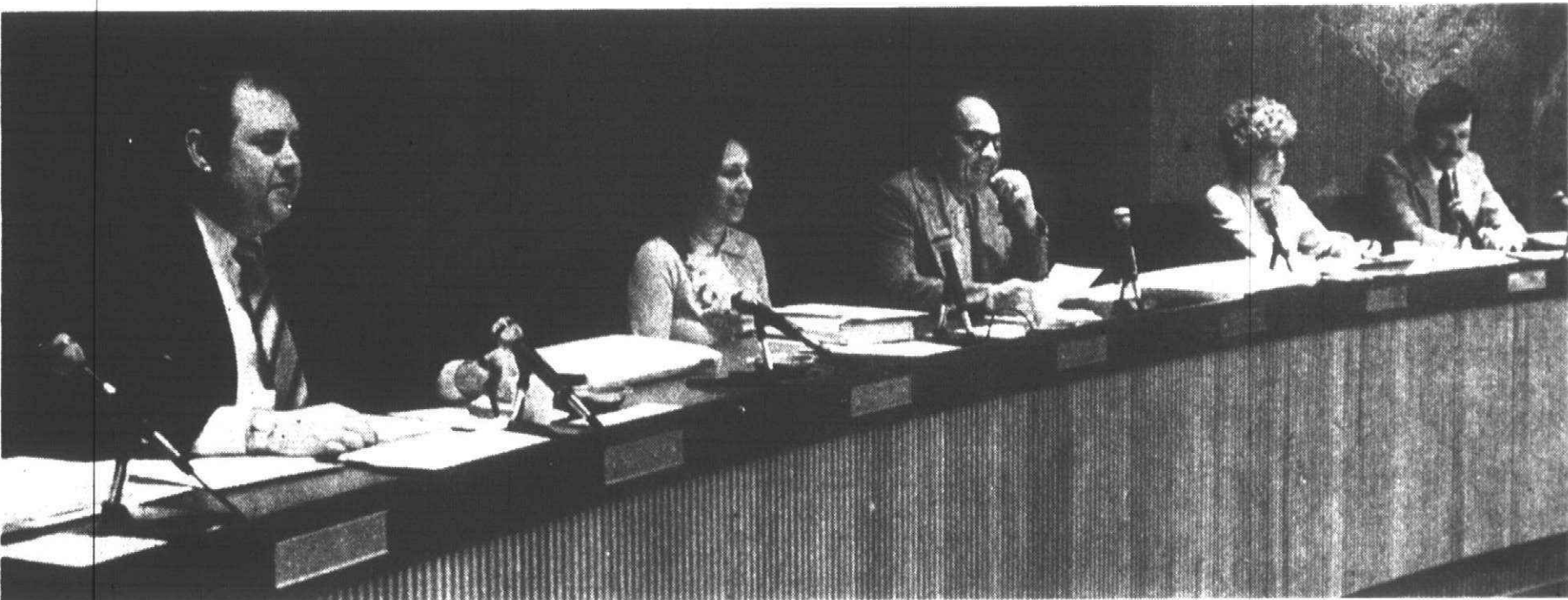
The atmosphere Thursday night was one of celebration.

State nixes road test

Policy drives instructors to worry

Nervous teens who fear goofing up during the driving test for their first Michigan operator's license don't have to worry about that anymore.

If they've passed drivers' education with flying colors, they don't have to take the road test.

In recent budget-cutting, the Michigan Secretary of State eliminated the road-test requirement, claiming it would save Michigan taxpayers \$600,000 annually by reducing the number of road examiners needed to give the tests.

Most youths on the threshold of earning their first license to drive are relieved by the change.

But professionals in the field of drivers' training are worried. They fear that the elimination of that final checkpoint will produce some student drivers who just aren't ready for the road.

In Plymouth-Canton Community Schools more than 1,000 student drivers are released on the road annually. The state's announcement, which took

effect Oct. 1, has generated concern from Fred Meier, an area coordinator in charge of some 11 high school drivers' education instructors.

Meier says he'll be calling a staff meeting of those instructors tomorrow to discuss alternatives his department can undertake to balance the impact of the final road testing.

"MY REACTION is that we'd be seeing some kids on the road that wouldn't be there, otherwise," said Meier.

"The state test was like a final exam. It made the students more aware that this is the last thing they had to pass. Our concern now is — should we be doing more at the park to compensate for the lack of the state test?"

Under the new regulations, teenagers 16-to-18 years old who have completed an accredited driver-education course and received a certificate within the past 12 months, may obtain a driver's license after passing vision, road sign and written tests.

The previous regulations, in addition to these tests, called for a 30-day interim period of driving with a licensed adult or parent. After this month's time, the student would receive the road test.

Most instructors called this interim period a good time to work the bugs out of drivers' habits, and prepare them for driving alone.

"The final was an incentive for the student to keep practicing," said Don Smith, a CEP driving instructor. "It was an incentive to keep working on their skills in various highway situations and polish those skills."

According to state regulations, high school students enrolled in school-sponsored driver's education programs need a minimum of 32 classroom hours of learning as well as a minimum of six hours driving time with an instructor.

"SOME KIDS needed this extra time, although there's nothing magical about 30 days," said Curt Perry, another CEP

driving instructor.

"I guess what will happen is that the parents of young drivers will have to be more responsible for them. A lot of kids I have now do fairly well but there are others who need the extra practice."

"What really scares me are those parents who don't give their children access to the family car for practice."

Eldon War, branch manager for the Canton Secretary of State office, cited statewide statistics that show as much as 12 percent of the first-time-out road-test takers fail.

Statistics for the Canton branch, which serves most Plymouth Salem High and Plymouth Canton High students, are lower, about 10 percent, he said.

Although most high school instructors felt secure in the knowledge that a second opinion was available at the state office on a student's driving abilities, War says the road tests were "pretty simple anyways."

And everywhere equipment — from modern computer and audiovisual to more basic learning tools such as the pencil sharpener.

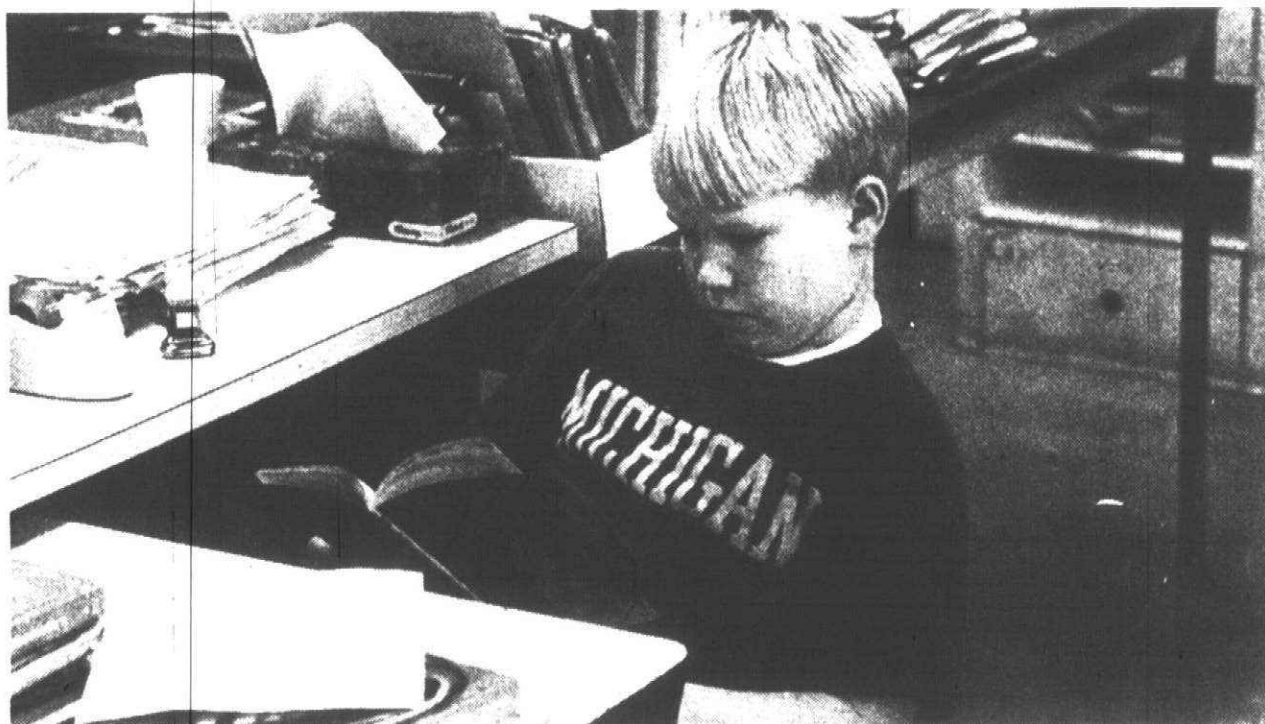


Jeff Kling, 10, is lost in a good book at Allen Elementary.

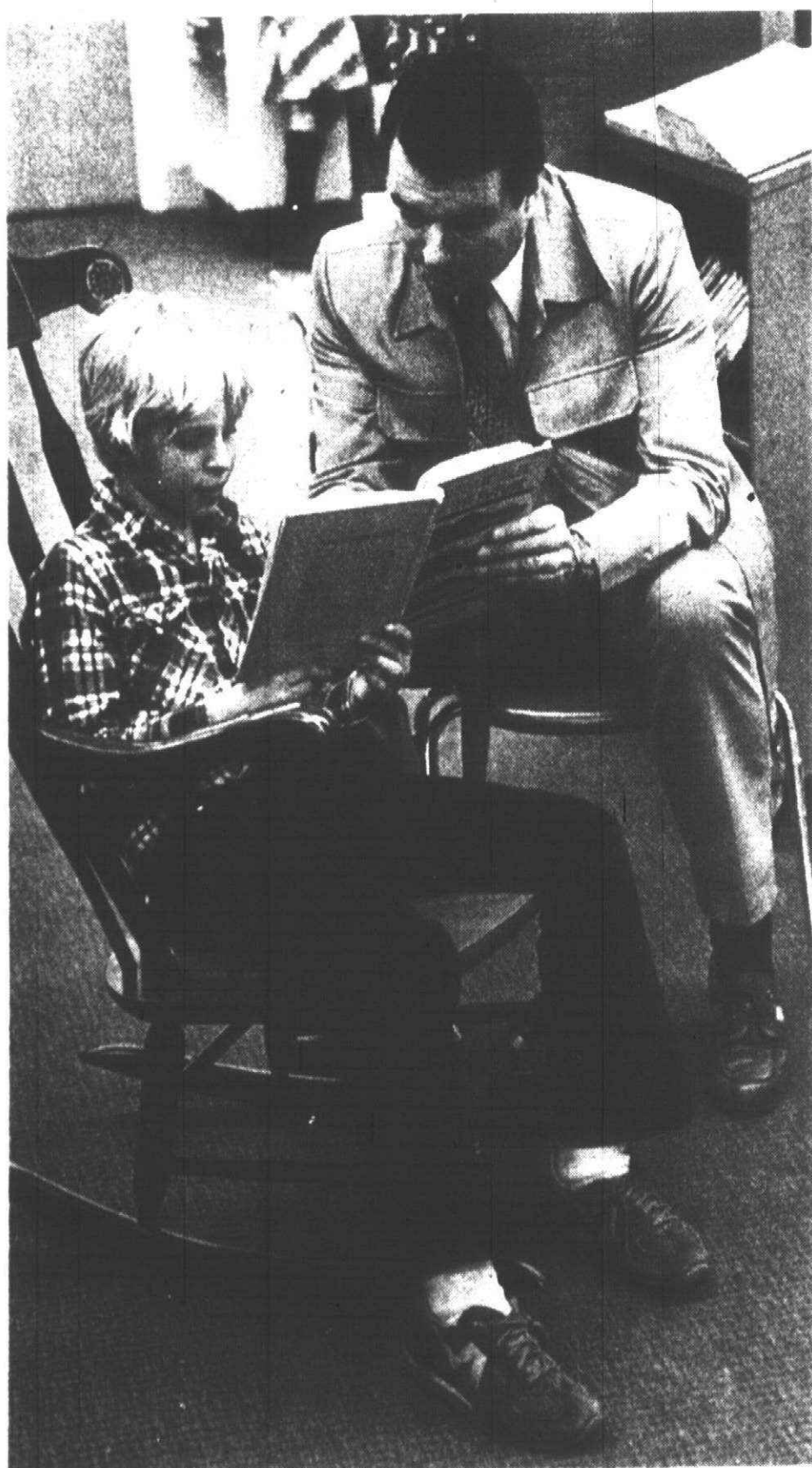


Candy Rettich, 6, is a first grader at Gallimore trying her hand at painting.

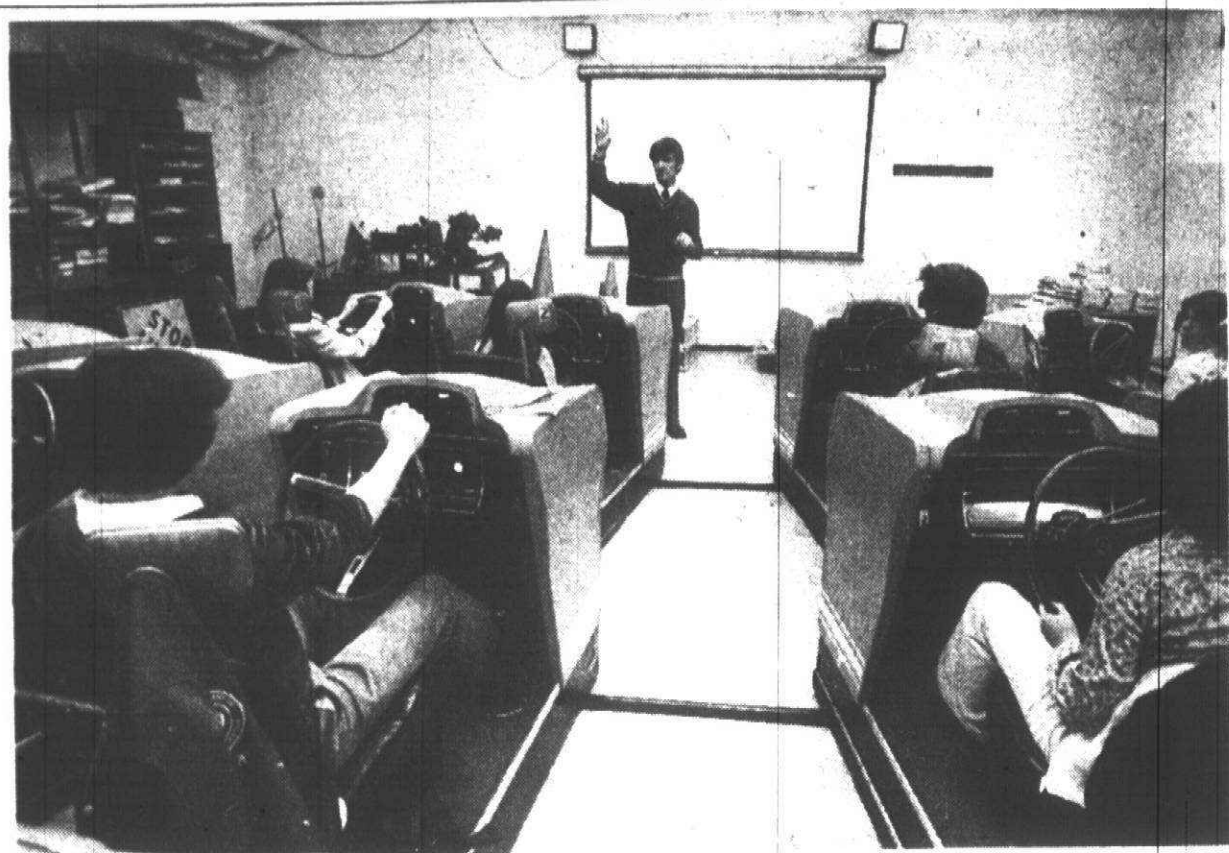

"It lasted about 15 minutes and it was pretty difficult to judge whether a person was qualified to go on the road," he said.

With the elimination of this road test for high schoolers, he also places the emphasis of responsibility on parents.

"The parents are the ones who have the opportunity to be with young drivers in many differ-

ent road situations, in heavy traffic, wet-roadway situations, and on expressways," he said.

Since Oct. 1, he said, the testing level at his office has dropped drastically. At one time as many as 10 road tests were administered daily. Today, the numbers have dropped to one-to-three daily. "Now we just have people over 18 years who haven't gone through a school program," he said.

Pupils file suit over search policy

Three high school students have gone to court to fight a school district policy which they say violates their right to privacy.

Attorneys for the American Civil Liberties Union filed suit Monday in U.S. District Court on behalf of Edward Wofford, Laura Homer and Beatrice Peak, students at Wayne Memorial High. The three are seniors who live in the city of Wayne.

The suit charges that the Wayne-Westland Board of Education, Wayne Memorial principal Francis Winters, and Dr. Timothy Dyer violated students' rights by asking them to sign forms which would allow their lockers and cars to be searched without their consent.

The suit claims that Wofford and Ms. Homer object to the car-search waivers and Ms. Peak claims she was denied a locker this year because she refused to sign the waiver.

However, school officials in the district, which includes southeast Canton, say that the locker-search waiver was abolished in the spring.

Winters said that when he found out that the waiver was being requested, he went on the public address system and announced that policy was being eliminated.

The students filing the suit say the policy was not changed.

"I FEEL I might have something in my car that has nothing to do with the health, safety and welfare of students," said Wofford, who acted as spokesman for the students. "It's none of their (school officials') business what's in my car."

Dan Slee, executive director of student activities for the district, said that the student code currently permits a search if the health, safety and welfare of students is threatened. He added that police are present when a locker is searched under suspicion of drugs or weapons.

"Each case stands on its own merit. I know it isn't being abused," he added.

Dyer, who had yet to be served with the suit Tuesday, called the legal action "frivolous."

"It's important that we maintain order," said Dyer. "We will obey the law, but we think we're obeying it right now."

THE SUIT ASKS that the court permanently prohibit the school district from requiring that such waivers be signed. It also asks District Court Judge Horace Gilmore, who will hear the case, to declare that the policy is a violation of the fourth amendment to

the U.S. Constitution and of the Michigan Constitution.

The Wayne-Westland parking waiver, which must be signed by a parent as well as a student, reads in part: "... I do agree and consent to the unlocking, opening and inspecting of the subject vehicle and of all the portions thereof including storage and engine areas. I do further agree and consent to the opening, examination and inspection of all items located in any such vehicle ... and I agree to make any and all lock keys available to the principal or his representative for this purpose."

Dyer said that the "question of transportation is legitimate. If they drive recklessly, they're going to lose their right to drive."

Attorney for the students, Elizabeth Gleicher from the Detroit firm of Goodman, Eden, Millender and Bedrosian, said that federal courts may hear cases that also involve violation of state law. Also filing the brief was attorney Ronald Reosti from the Detroit firm of Reosti and Papakhian.

The school district has 20 days in which to respond, after which a schedule of hearings will be established. Ms. Gleicher predicted that the suit would be settled without a trial. She said that she expects the case to be settled within the next six months.

Ms. Gleicher said that the ACLU has received frequent complaints about similar waivers from other students throughout the state. They said the policy to ask that waivers be signed actually began after a 1979 state attorney general's opinion that said searches were prohibited unless there was just cause.

"It got to the point that so many cases were being handled that the ACLU decided that the next ones (students) who called in would be considered for a test case," explained Ms. Gleicher. For that reason, she said they probably would decline any out-of-court settlement.

Ms. Gleicher said she expected to file a similar suit Thursday in U.S. District Court on behalf of two Roseville students. She said that suit may be joined with the Wayne-Westland complaint.

THE ACLU WAS first contacted in the Wayne-Westland case about six weeks ago.

"I needed to park in the student lot this year," said Wofford, who, according to the suit, has an early class before bus transportation is available. "Last year I parked on side streets and got some parking tickets."

"So I looked at the form and I said, 'You're kidding me.' I decided to do something about it," he continued.

That's when Wofford said he decided to talk with a former teacher of his, Lynn Ehrle, who is a member of the ACLU and teaches classes in consumer rights and remedies, American history and contemporary problems.

"I talked to him and asked if there was something I could do about it. He said yes," continued Wofford. "So he went out and asked a couple of other students if they felt the same way about it. He actually contacted the ACLU for us."

Ehrle had complained to the board of education in a meeting last June about the policy. The board subsequently proposed that the a formal review of the student code be undertaken. A report on that review is expected in early December.

EHRLE SAID that "coercion" was used to get students to sign locker-search waivers.

"They (students) couldn't get out until they registered. They couldn't register until they got a locker and they had to sign a waiver to get the locker," he said. "Morally and ethically this is not a good practice. It's a question of prior guilt and that's what I object to. The time when we could treat a student as a second-class citizen is long past."

Principal Winter denied that any coercion was used.

"A mistake was made and it was rectified," said assistant superintendent Dennis O'Neill about the locker permits. "But our attorneys have no prob-

lem with the student code."

District administrators have previously touted the code as having been a model for others in the state.

MS. GLEICHER said that she and Reosti decided against a class-action suit because it would be expensive and difficult to set up.

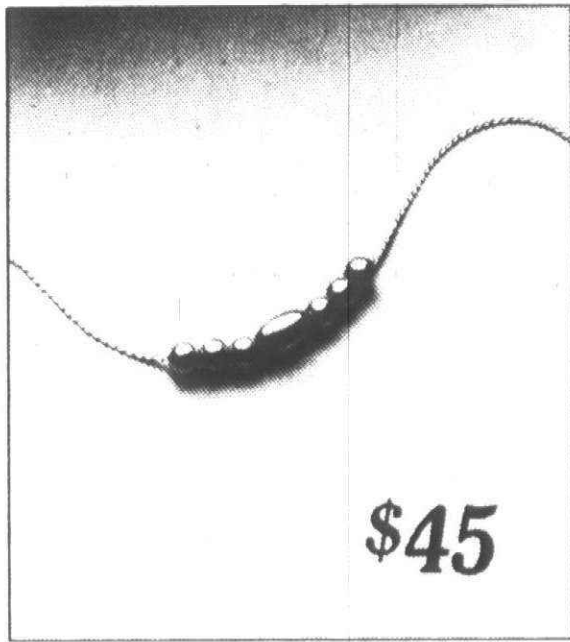
"We would have to notify all the members of that class (all students at Wayne Memorial) and that would be beyond the (financial) means of the ACLU," she added.

Instead, the suit seeks declaratory relief which would affect all students at the school and set a precedent. Other cases, however, which lie outside the southeastern Michigan jurisdiction of this U.S. District Court, probably would have to be litigated again, according to Ms. Gleicher.

"The principle here is that a citizen cannot be searched at random," she said. "An official must respect privacy before effecting a search or seizure. This applies to students as well as adults. Students don't shed their rights at the school-house door."

"An educational institution has to teach what is the law. That's its essential function. There's no doubt the law protects students. Our position is that it is unreasonable to request students to waive their fourth amendment rights," Ms. Gleicher continued.

"We're not saying never search, but you do when there is probable cause individually determined on the facts and circumstances of each case."

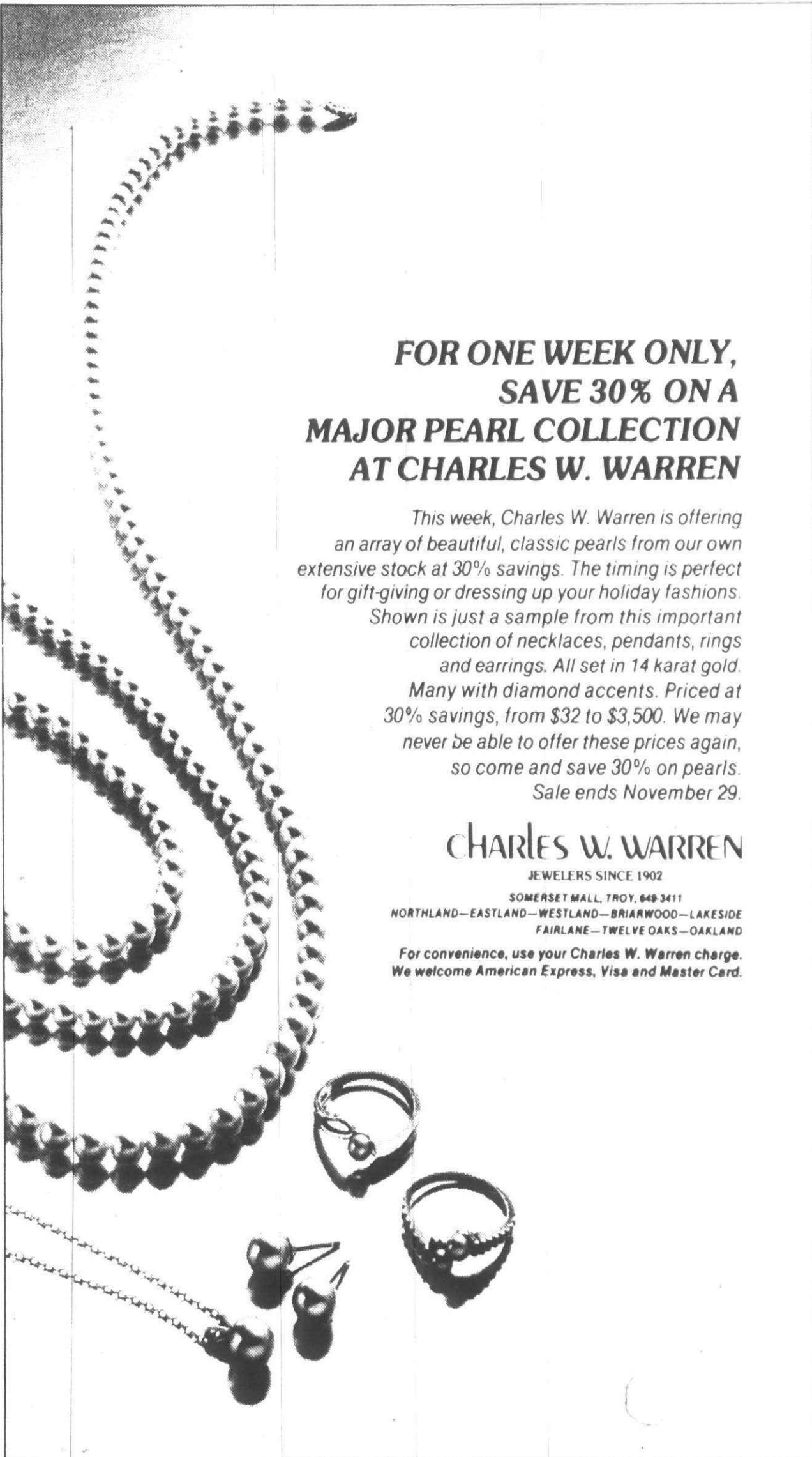

It didn't take long to confirm I.M.'s proclamation that the holiday shopping season had indeed arrived. All the discount stores — Kmart, Meijer's Thrifty Acres — were rolling in the Christmas items to replace the unsold Halloween merchandise.

The idea struck me again later that day as I watched another TV Christmas commercial. The realization that seven weeks from now I would be seeing the same ads for the umpteenth time depressed me.

A few companies really cash in on the season, I thought while watching. Viewers are bombarded by their commercials advertising products which I don't either need or use.

Remember Mood Rings? Hot shaving lather dispensers, too, had their holiday moment. So did Vegomatics, Home Winemaker kits, and Pocket Fishermans.

Ronco Teleproducts Inc. is a big seller of some of the more unique products devised by man.

"RONCO'S AUTO CUP. Has this ever happened to you (man pictured spills a half gallon of coffee on his suit while driving)? It will never happen with Ronco's Auto Cup. Turn it upside down, it won't spill. Handy handle makes it easy to carry anywhere — boating, golfing, skiing, anywhere.
"The perfect gift."

Ronco will be marketing 14 products this Christmas, said the company spokeswoman who would identify herself only as "Dorey." The woman was very suspicious and asked more questions than she would answer. Apparently, she feared I might be a competitor wanting to steal one of Ronco's gift ideas.

Among the "perfect gifts" Ronco will be marketing this year, other than the Auto Cup, is the Miracle Broom, Miracle Sander, Roller Measure, Cellulose, Battery Tester, Ornamental Ice and the Egg Scrambler.

Sorry, but the Bottle and Jar Cutter, and the Studsetter aren't scheduled for release, she told me. Any remaining on store shelves are leftovers from previous seasons.

"We manufacture and distribute products sold during the Christmas season," Dorey said. The slogan reminded me of a chubby guy in a red suit who used to give away presents at Christmas.

ONLY THE white-bearded fellow wasn't interested in making a profit. To Ronco and other similar companies, Christmas means making money. Lots of it.

"Yeah?" I shot back. "Do you still use any of 'em?"

"Sure," he answered sarcastically. "How many bottles can you turn into glasses? How much ornamental ice can you use? How many times do you want to hear the 'Top 40 Hits of 1976'?"

"Then what good are they?" I inquired.

"They save you a helluva headache in finding the right gift when you're Christmas shopping," he mumbled, his attention once again riveted on the screen in front of him.

Partying raised Pilgrims' hackles

Imagine this. You are a Pilgrim. You have crossed a stormy ocean in a small boat called the Mayflower with others of your ilk. You survive a winter with little food. You invent Thanksgiving.

After five years of struggle, you begin to think you've successfully escaped the sinful bawdiness of old England. You are building up the kind of strict religious community you wanted.

Then from a point several miles away comes the sound of music, definitely not hymns. People are laughing and drinking. They are even prancing around the maypole in the tradition of their homeland. A colony of hippies has moved next door.

The place was Ma-re Mount, called Merry Mount by historians. Its leader was Thomas Morton, an Englishman of good family who trained for the law and could read Latin.

In the year 1625 the phrase "alternative culture" was a long way in the future. But it was clear that this man marched to a different drummer.

AFTER HIS arrival, the group of non-Pilgrims with whom he was associated had a falling out. Some of the partners left.

Morton then started an early American revolution by urging the servants who had been left behind to leave their few remaining masters and throw in with him.

In his book "Saints and Strangers," George Willison pointed out that a number of indentured servants in those days had been taken by Englishmen and sold as virtual slaves in Virginia. Having heard about this, the servants needed little persuasion to join Morton.

The party began.

In his diary, Pilgrim governor William Bradford unloaded his feelings about this social event of the year. The spelling is his.

"After this, they fell to great licentiousness, and led a dissolute life, powering out them selves into all profaneness. And Morton became lord of misrule, and maintained (as it were) a school of Athisme. And after they had got some good into their hands, and gott much by trading with the Indians, they spent it as vainly, in quaffing and drinking both wine and strong waters in great excess."

"They also set up a May-pole, drinking and dancing about together, inviting the Indian women, for their consorts, dancing and frisking together (like so many fairies, or furies rather,) and worse practices."

Bradford also was pretty uncomfortable with Morton's poetry, saying he composed "sundry rimes and verses, some tending to lasciviousness."

THE PILGRIMS were worried their own members might join in the quaffing and worse practices. Their own indentured servants might leave.

They were also nervous about Morton's success in the beaver trade. He hired Indians to help him and was cutting into the Pilgrims' beaver take. They counted on selling the skins in England to obtain supplies they needed to sustain them.

And they accused him of selling liquor and guns to the Indians.

So they managed to get him deported back to England.

BUT LIKE A BAD halfpenny, he returned a year later. In the meantime, in England he wrote a satire on the Pilgrims called New England Canaan, which Willison describes as "one of the liveliest, wittiest and most informative books of the day."

He also worked to end the patents that gave the Pilgrims and Puritans the right to their land.

Once he was back in this country, the battles started all over again. But eventually the Pilgrims managed to remove Morton again.

He was tried on a charge of harming the Indians, Williston reports. The historian added, however, that "The plain truth was that he got along with them only too well."

Again he was returned to England, and did not come back until 1643. But the Pilgrims and Puritans were persistent and jailed him in Massachusetts.

When released, he went to Maine and lived out his life in poverty. Willison includes a comment from someone who saw him before he died. The word was that he had fallen so low he was "content to drinke water."

Morton's opinion of the Pilgrims was that they "made a great shewe of religion, but no humanity."

Monument rocks view of history

Every year at Thanksgiving, schoolchildren get to color in pictures of brave and heroic pilgrims with their blue wool capes blowing in the cold winter wind, taking their first tentative steps onto these shores.

The women are always dark-haired and dark-eyed — probably drawn to vaguely resemble Jennifer Jones.

The men are always strong-chinned, chiseled-cheeked and blue eyed — the surfer look before California was fully settled.

Then there's Plymouth Rock, itself. It's dark and craggy like all good historic rocks. It's also always depicted as a large beacon in the white-capped ocean.

It's a picture that was in all the school texts when I was a kid. If you gaze on it long enough, you could almost hear dainty Priscilla admonishing, "Speak for yourself, John."

You could almost wish that John had spoken sooner for himself, thus sparking schoolchildren another poem to learn and possibly keeping the rest of us from the sight of several more New England tourist traps.

Plymouth, Mass., could have preserved that illusion if it hadn't decided to turn the Rock into a tourist attraction.

TOURIST ATTRACTION or not, I'm irresistibly drawn to anything any little town wants to call historic. Sometimes it pays off, as it did the time I visited a little museum located inside an old courthouse in Nova Scotia.

The caretaker, a woman who lived there all her

life, took special delight in showing off the vintage wedding dress which couldn't have been worn by a woman taller than five feet.

"Weren't they small, then?" my guide cooed.

Then, she directed my attention to the place in the ceiling which had supported the rope for the town's only hanging, which occurred shortly after the town's only murder.

"Terrible, wasn't it?" my guide said.

So it was absolutely necessary that I finally get to see this craggy, rugged rock which had once supported the delicate and dainty Priscilla and the rest of the Mayflower crew.

In the middle of the still little town of Plymouth, Mass., there stands a little gazebo near the bay where the respectful and the curious come to finally eye the Rock.

Most of them, I'm sure, come to this spot expecting to see a piece of granite resembling the logo used in the Mutual of Omaha commercials.

Next to the rock, itself, are tourist guides dressed up as Mayflower passengers might have dressed, waiting to answer questions and give directions.

THE ROCK ITSELF stands in a little cell dug out

of the earth so the visitor must look downward to see it.

There, on the bottom of this pit, held together mainly by plaster — in fact, I dare say it is mostly plaster — is what passes these days for Plymouth Rock.

No great craggy monument to will and determination. No moment of drama or poignant remembrance of those in other times who have come here for the same reasons as these, the first immigrants. Not even one old-time resident dressed in everyday clothes to point to the places made memorable to local history.

Instead, just to make sure you recognize the piece of plaster for what it is, there is the date 1620 stamped on it.

The little booklet tourists get when they visit this little chip off the old rock prudently shies away from actually saying that this is the Pilgrim's rock.

Instead, it confesses that a few generations after the Pilgrims settled, a grizzled old man who claimed to remember such hallowed traditions, pointed his finger at this little rock and informed the town that, yes, this was the very rock their forebearers had touched.

Just in case all of this hasn't touched you, the final note in this scenario takes place, not near the tourist site, but across the street where the John Alden Ice Cream Stand does business.

YOU CAN'T miss it. It's the only ice cream place in town that has John Alden's hat, head and shoulders resting larger than life on its roof.

Anyone for an Aldenburger?

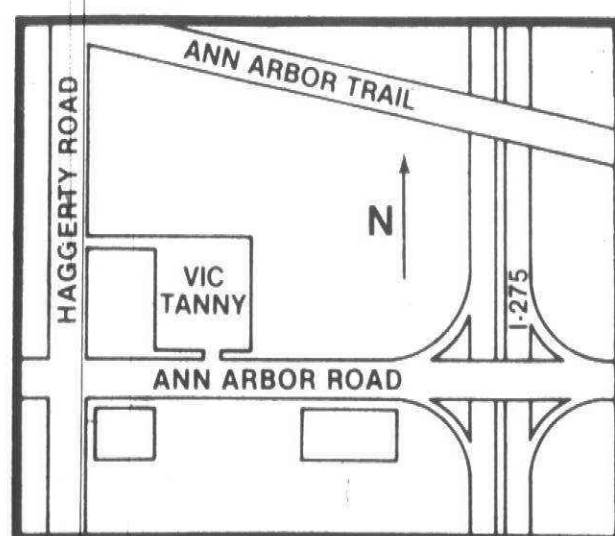

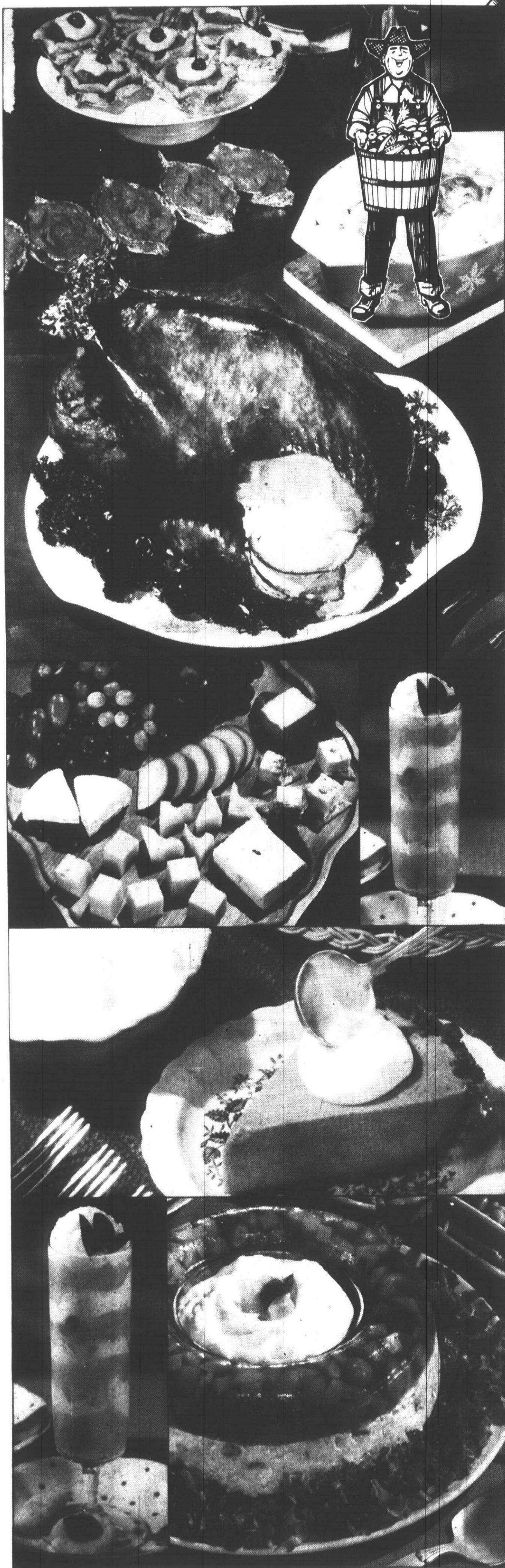

Your Advent Cooking Calendar calls for a bubbling cauldron of Merrie Olde Brandied Mincemeat along with other brandied baubles.

There's an old saying in the little English village of Shropshire that the twelve days of Christmas are a mirror of the year. For each brandied mincemeat treat eaten at a hospitable neighbor's house during that period, you're destined to have one happy month. To insure your good luck, you'd best supply your neighbors well in advance — there's a lot of Christmas baking to be done and much of it begins with a crock of homemade mincemeat.

This old Victorian recipe is bright with the flavor of a whole orange and lemon with an abundance of candied fruits and raisins. The brandy is the catalyst that marries the flavors and preserves them for months to come.

MERRIE OLDE BRANDIED MINCEMEAT

| 1 small navel orange | 4 cups packed brown sugar |
| 1 small lemon | 1 tablespoon cinnamon |
| 8 cups finely diced unpeeled apples | 1-1/2 teaspoons each ground nutmeg, cloves and allspice |
| 1-1/2 cups golden raisins | 1-1/2 teaspoons salt |
| 1-1/2 cups seedless raisins | 1-1/4 cups Brandy |
| 1 cup mixed diced candied fruits | |
| 1 cup orange juice | |

Quarter and seed orange and lemon. Grind in food grinder or food processor fitted with steel blade. In Dutch oven combine ground orange and lemon, apples, raisins, candied fruits and orange juice. Bring to boil, reduce heat and simmer 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add sugar, spices and salt. Simmer 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add 1 cup of the brandy. Simmer, stirring occasionally, until mixture is thick like jam, about 1 hour. Remove from heat. Stir in remaining brandy. Store covered in refrigerator up to 2 months. Makes about 2-1/2 quarts.

BRANDY-GLAZED MINCEMEAT BARS

In large bowl combine butter, sugar and molasses. Beat until fluffy. Beat in egg. Beat in ginger, baking soda and salt. Add flour, oats and walnuts. Mix to blend thoroughly. Spread half of dough evenly in bottom of greased 9x13-inch baking pan. Spread evenly with mincemeat, and then with remaining dough. Bake in 350 degree oven 35 to 45 minutes until lightly browned and springy to the touch. Cool on wire rack. In small bowl beat together powdered sugar, milk and brandy until smooth. Drizzle over cooled cake. Cut into bars about 1x2-inches. Makes 4 dozen bars.

Note: After cooling and cutting, bars may be securely wrapped and frozen up to 1 month. Drizzle with glaze after bars are thawed.

BRANDIED MINCEMEAT COFFEE CAKE

| 1/2 cup warm water (110 to 115 degrees) | 6 to 6-1/2 cups flour |

In small bowl dissolve yeast in warm water; set aside. In small saucepan scald milk. Stir in butter, sugar, salt and mace. Cool to lukewarm. Blend in eggs and yeast mixture. In large bowl beat yeast mixture with 5-1/2 cups of the flour. Turn out onto board and knead in enough of the remaining flour to make a smooth and satiny dough, kneading about 10 minutes. Place in greased bowl. Cover and let rise in warm place until doubled, 1 to 1-1/2 hours. Punch down. Divide dough into two equal portions. On floured board roll one portion into a 10x20-inch rectangle. Cover evenly with 1-1/2 cups of the mincemeat to within 1/2 inch of edges. From long side, roll as for jelly roll. Pinch seam to seal. Fit into greased deep 10-inch tube pan, seam-side up. On floured board roll remaining dough into a 10x12-inch rectangle. Cover evenly with remaining 1-1/2 cups of the mincemeat to within 1/2 inch of edges. From long side, roll as for jelly roll. Pinch seam to seal. With sharp knife, cut into 8 equal slices. Brush ring in pan lightly with water. Arrange slices over ring, cut-sides facing up. Cover and let rise in warm place until cake reaches top of pan, 1 to 1-1/2 hours. Bake on lower rack of 375 degree oven 45 to 55 minutes until browned and springy to the touch. (When top becomes sufficiently brown, cover lightly with foil.) Cool on rack 15 minutes. Remove from pan; cool on rack upright. In small bowl mix powdered sugar, lemon peel and brandy until smooth. Drizzle over cake. Makes 1 cake (12 to 16 servings).



BRANDY SNOWBALLS

In large bowl combine butter, milk, 3 tablespoons brandy, the granulated sugar, eggs, baking powder and 2-1/2 cups of the flour. Beat with electric mixer at low speed 2 minutes, scraping sides of bowl as needed. Mix in remaining flour to form a soft dough. With lightly floured hands form dough into 96 smooth 3/4-inch balls. Place 1 inch apart on greased baking sheets. Bake in 325 degree oven 15 to 20 minutes until bottoms of cookies are lightly browned. While cookies are warm, hollow out from flat sides with small pointed knife. Reserve crumbs. Prepare Brandy Chocolate Filling. Fill each cookie with filling mixture. Press two filled cookies together to form a ball. Repeat with remaining cookies. In small bowl combine corn syrup and 1 tablespoon brandy. Brush each ball with brandy mixture and immediately roll in powdered sugar to coat heavily. Sprinkle with colored sugar, if desired. (Cookies may be made in advance and frozen up to the point of brushing with brandy mixture and rolling in sugar.) Makes 4 dozen cookies.

| 1-1/2 cups (8 ounces) coarsely chopped dried apricots | 1/2 teaspoon baking soda |
| 2/3 cup Brandy | 1 tablespoon baking powder |
| 1/3 cup water | 1/2 teaspoon salt |
| 1 cup sugar | 2-3/4 cups flour |
| 2 eggs | 1 cup chopped nuts |
| 1/3 cup vegetable oil | Brandied Cream Cheese (recipe follows) |

In 1-quart saucepan combine apricots, brandy and water. Bring just to boil. Remove from heat and set aside 10 minutes. In large bowl combine sugar, eggs, oil, baking soda and liquid drained from apricots. Beat 2 minutes. Mix in baking powder, salt, flour and apricots just to blend. Fold in nuts. Turn equally into 2 greased and floured 8-1/2x4-1/2x2-5/8-inch loaf pans. Bake in 350 degree oven 35 to 45 minutes until tops are browned and loaves are springy to the touch. Cool 5 minutes. Turn out on wire racks. Wrap in aluminum foil while still slightly warm. Store 24 hours before slicing. Serve with Brandied Cream Cheese. Makes 2 loaves (about 1-1/4 pounds each).

Note: Brandied Apricot Loaves may be securely wrapped and frozen up to 1 month.

In mixing bowl cream butter and sugar until fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating to blend well. Combine flour, baking powder and salt. Stir into creamed mixture alternately with milk. Measure tablespoonfuls of batter into greased madeleine molds or muffin tin cups (2-3/4-inch). Bake in preheated 350 degree oven 15 to 18 minutes, until edges are browned and cakes are springy to the touch. Loosen and remove from molds; cool on wire racks. Clean and regrease molds as needed to bake remaining batter. Dip cakes, a few at a time, in Brandied Lime Syrup; drain. Dust generously with powdered sugar. Makes about 4-1/2 dozen.

A Question of Taste

It's a far cry from a Norman Rockwell painting

In early October I served a turkey dinner. It was a sort of dry run for Thanksgiving. There are still a few wrinkles to be ironed out even after years of this kind of an ordeal.

Most of these wrinkles have to do with the chaos that ensues in the half hour between the time dinner is scheduled and the actual time it is all together on the table.

By this time everyone over the age of reason (or tall enough to reach a kitchen counter) has been pressed into service — mashing potatoes, stirring gravy, slicing the meat, running platters and bowls from kitchen to dining room. At least half of the food is stone cold. I am dressed in old jeans and a sweater. Cooking in good clothes would be foolhardy given the exorbitant cost of dry cleaning.

The total picture is a far cry from the photographs of holiday meals in women's magazines or in Norman Rockwell paintings. Rafts of steaming-hot dishes, artistically arranged, grace a long harvest table ringed by a congenial three-generation family dressed in their Sunday best. They are preparing to invoke a lengthy blessing — a luxury they can afford since the food is still piping hot and dinner is on schedule.

I ATTRIBUTE part of my failure to reach this ideal to the gap between the number of last-minute, top-of-the-stove dishes I attempt and the number of burners on my stove.

Given the limitations of a four-burner stove, the only question was which vegetables would suffer the least from sitting out for 15 minutes while the rest cooked.

After years of hoping that this dilemma would resolve itself, I have determined to attempt another approach this Thanksgiving. Since some vegetables will be served cold anyway, I will capitate and serve them well-chilled, in a marinade.

The other half of the vegetables — those to be served hot — will be prepared ahead of time in dishes which can bake during the crucial half-hour before dinner. The turkey should be allowed to "rest," outside of the oven during this half hour anyway so the reserved heat of the oven can be put to good use and the top of the stove clutter and scramble reduced to manageable proportions.

WITH THIS GOAL in mind, I have assembled some of my favorite baked vegetable recipes.

If broccoli is being served, it can appear in a festive, hot molded shape, baked in a creamy Swiss-cheese flavored custard.

Carrots can retain their crisp texture and sweet flavor when cooked quickly on top of the stove and then baked, blanketed by an unusual sauce, sparked by horseradish. An alternative presentation for carrots teams them with brussels sprouts in a rich veloute sauce. Although this last dish does not require baking, it could be prepared early in the day and reheated at serving time.

The hot Broccoli Mold and Company Carrots can be prepared early in the day and baked just prior to serving.

BROCCOLI MOLD

1 bunch broccoli, well trimmed, flowerets broken into small pieces
Boiling, salted water
1/4 cup chicken broth
3 tbsp. butter
1/4 cup chopped scallions
3 tbsp. flour
1 cup sour cream
3 eggs, lightly beaten
1/2 cup grated Swiss cheese
1 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
1/2 tsp. grated nutmeg
1/4 cup finely chopped toasted almonds

1) Place broccoli in a saucepan and cover with boiling salted water. Cover, bring to a boil and boil rapidly about eight minutes or until crisp-tender. Drain well. 2) Preheat oven to 350 degrees. 3) Chop broccoli finely and add the chicken broth. 4) Melt the butter, add scallions and saute until tender. Stir in the flour and cook, stirring, one minute. 5) Blend in the sour cream and cook, stirring constantly, until thick, but don't allow to boil. Remove from heat and stir in the eggs. 6) Stir in the broccoli mixture and remaining ingredients and turn into a well-greased 5-cup ring mold. Set in a shallow pan of boiling water and bake 45 minutes. 7) Let stand 5 minutes. Run a knife around edges and unmold onto warm platter. Makes 6-8 servings.

COMPANY CARROTS

2 1/2 lb. whole carrots
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 tbsp. minced onion
1 tbsp. prepared horseradish
Salt and pepper to taste
1/4 cup finely crushed saltine crackers
Parsley, chopped
Paprika
Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Cook carrots in boiling salted water until fork-tender. Reserve 1/4 cup cooking

liquid. Cut carrots lengthwise in narrow strips. Arrange in a 9-inch square baking dish; set aside.

Combine reserved cooking liquid with mayonnaise, onion, horseradish, salt, and pepper. (The sauce may be done ahead and refrigerated.) Pour sauce over carrots. Sprinkle cracker crumbs on top. Sprinkle with parsley and paprika. Bake for 20 minutes. Makes 8 servings.

BRUSSELS SPROUTS

AND CARROTS A LA POULETTE
1/2 lb. carrots
1/2 lb. small or medium Brussels sprouts
1/4 cup butter
salt
pepper
3/4 cup veloute sauce (recipe follows)
1 egg yolk
1/2 cup heavy cream
parsley

In a saucepan, blanch the carrots, trimmed into olive shapes, in boiling salted water to cover for 5 minutes and drain them. Cook the Brussels sprouts, boiling them for only 8 minutes. In a skillet, toss the carrots and Brussels

sprouts in the butter with salt and pepper to taste over moderate heat until they are coated with the butter. Add the veloute sauce and simmer, covered, 10 minutes. Remove from the heat and stir in the egg yolk, lightly beaten with the heavy cream. Return to the heat and cook over moderate heat, stirring, until the sauce just thickens. Season with salt and pepper and sprinkle with minced parsley. Serves 4.

VELOUTE SAUCE

1 1/2 tsp. minced onion
1 1/2 tsp. butter
2 tbsp. flour
1 1/2 cups chicken stock
1/2 tsp. salt
White pepper

In a saucepan, saute the onion in the butter until it is softened. Stir in the flour and cook the roux over low heat, stirring for 3 minutes. Remove from the heat and pour in the chicken stock, scalded, whisking vigorously until mixture is thick and smooth. Add the salt and white pepper to taste and simmer 15 minutes. Strain the sauce through a fine sieve and cover it with a buttered round of wax paper to prevent a film from forming. Makes 1 1/2 cups.



Byrd's Kitchen

Thanksgiving menu combined old and new traditions

The Lauretti family is part Italian, part Sicilian. Italy and Sicily each contributed one pair of grandparents, who immigrated to Connecticut some years ago. My sister Sharon married into their family.

On a holiday visit with them in 1978, we were served the following Thanksgiving dinner:

Stuffed Artichokes
Escarole Soup
Lasagna
Roast Turkey with Herb Stuffing
Whole Cranberry Sauce
Corn Souffle
Fresh Green Beans in Butter Sauce
Fresh Italian Bread and Rolls
Tossed Green Salad
Cannoli
Chocolate Cake
Coffee and Tea

The salad was served after the main course, in the European manner, an arrangement designed to allow for clearing of the palate between the main course and dessert. Wine accompanied

the dinner and brandy was offered with the coffee, along with bowls of nuts, as well as dishes of candies and mints.

It was a sumptuous meal that successfully combined a Mediterranean heritage with American tradition.

The grownups remained at the dining-room table through all the courses, but the youngsters would disappear to the basement playroom during the courses which did not interest them.

Everything served, except the bread and rolls, was homemade. The Escarole Soup was prepared with a chicken-stock base, to which dumplings and fresh escarole had been added.

Artichokes, which had been stuffed with garlic, cheese and bread crumbs, were then steamed until tender. Their aroma wafted through the house, drawing all the family to the kitchen.

The weather that weekend was cold, crisp and breezy, lit by a bright fall sun, the kind of weather that clears out the cobwebs from the mind and sharpens memories, particularly poignant ones.

For the Laurettis, it was the first major holiday since the death of their mother. All the children, the two young grandchildren, and assorted visitors, had gathered at the father's home. As each family member was reminded of a dish the mother had always prepared for Thanksgiving, the dish was added to the menu.

The artichokes were remembered only the night before, necessitating a last-minute search through local grocery stores. Six or eight artichokes were finally found and purchased. Though they were a smaller size than usually would have been chosen, they were the only artichokes to be found in the area. Trimmed and prepared, the vegetables' appearance improved greatly, adding to the considerable success of the meal.

STUFFED ARTICHOKE LAURETTI

To prepare the vegetable:

Cut the stem from the artichoke,

leaving the bottom flat. Slice off the top of the vegetable as well. Snip the points from the lower leaves with scissors. Rub the cuts briefly with lemon juice to prevent discoloration.

Press the artichoke, top side down, against the counter-top to open up the inside for the stuffing. Soak for a few minutes in cold water and then drain.

STUFFING

For each artichoke, you will need:
1 or 2 small cloves chopped garlic
1/2 tsp. chopped parsley
1 or 2 tsp. grated Parmesan cheese
1 or 2 tsp. bread crumbs or package stuffing
2 or 3 cured black olives (optional)
1 tsp. salad oil (or olive oil, if you prefer the taste)

Alternate amounts are given above as the size of the artichoke (small, medium or large) will determine the amount needed for stuffing.



Stuff the garlic and parsley into the center and between the outer leaves of the artichoke. Sprinkle the cheese and the stuffing into the center and outer leaves. If necessary, pull the leaves out to do this. Arrange the olives in the same manner, if you are using the olives. Sprinkle the salad oil (or olive oil) on top of each artichoke to keep it from drying out during the cooking process and for additional flavor.

Steam over a small amount of water

at medium heat until the outer leaves come out easily. Can be served warm, at room temperature or cold, as an appetizer or a vegetable side dish.

Note: The cheese and olives add salt, but you may wish to add salt (slight amount) before stuffing.

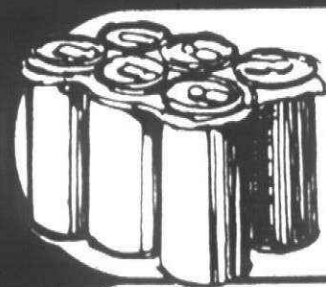

DAR chapter marks 54th anniversary of founding

The women who gathered at the Miles Standish Room of the Mayflower Hotel last Monday were there to attend a birthday party.

The Daughters of the American Revolution were celebrating the 54th anniversary of the founding of the Sarah Ann Cochrane chapter of the national organization, which was 90 years old in October.

Laura Baumhart, chapter regent, and Doris Richard, vice regent, welcomed Mrs. Maxwell Hunt, state regent, and visiting regents from neighboring chapters.

It was Dec. 13, 1926 that Mrs. Frederick A. Lendrum had a luncheon in her home in Plymouth. In attendance were eight DAR members at large and six new members who had met to organize a DAR chapter.

In February of the following year, the members decided to invite the women of Northville who were eligible for membership to join the chapter. When the charter was granted in March 8, 1928, there were 24 members.

THE NEW CHAPTER was named for Sarah Ann Cochrane, daughter of a pioneer Michigan family and direct descendant of five Revolutionary War soldiers.

She had come to Northville in 1843 when her father, the Rev. Sylvester Cochrane, became minister of the new Presbyterian church in the village. In 1845, he founded the Northville Academy, where Sarah and her brother Lyman, who later became a judge in Detroit, were teachers.

History notes that the Cochranes were the first family in Northville to own a kerosene lamp, which the Northville Historical Society has in its collection.

After the death of her parents, Sarah Ann Cochrane became associated with the Detroit Public Library, where she supervised the introduction of the

Dewey decimal system. All members of the Cochrane family are buried in Northville.

THE CHAPTER continues to grow with the addition of young members, maintaining a membership of 100 or more women.

As well as many local projects — working closely with and making contributions to the Northville, Plymouth and Livonia historical societies and their projects; presenting good citizenship awards to students; conducting annual essay contests; and doing volunteer work in Veterans Hospitals — the chapter supports national endeavors.

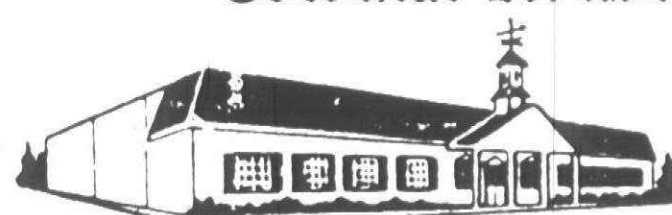
The DAR National Headquarters in Washington, D.C. covers an entire city block. There are three adjoining buildings on 17th Street near the White House — Memorial Continental Hall, Constitution Hall and Administration Building. This is the largest group of buildings in the world owned and maintained exclusively by women.

Threefold objectives are historic preservation, promotion of education and patriotic endeavor. Sarah Ann Cochrane and other chapters contribute to the funds that keep the DAR and schools, and Indian school and scholarships going; the conservation projects; the publication of Manuals for Citizenship; student loans and scholarships; lineage research; and the thousands of flags and flag codes (many in Braille) donated each year.

Contented housewife speaks out

Terry Hekker says she's one of an endangered species — a housewife. But she had a roomful of company at the Plymouth Hilton Inn.

The author of "Ever Since Adam and Eve," a witty book that defends "the world's second oldest but most obsolete profession," proved to be a woman with whom her audience could relate.

She drew applause as she admitted liking being a woman, declaring, "Women are a wonderful species — we can hold any job, but our most important job is raising the next generation."

She lists as qualifications for writing her book the fact that she "has been married for 24 years to a man toward whom I have a cheap physical attraction and I have five children."

"I was beginning to feel I was like a carton of yogurt with an expiration date stamped on my bottom," she told her audience of more than 500, "so I wrote a letter to my newspaper (The New York Times) about my frustrations, it was printed on the Op Ed page and picked up by other papers around the country."

"I was surprised to receive thousands of letters in response."

MRS. HEKKER draws on experiences of her family, which in addition to four sons and a daughter included a mother and an Irish grandmother with "common sense that is not so common."

"When my daughter was born after I had three sons," she said, my grandmother told me, "There's no such thing as little girls, they're just short women, but men are always tall boys."

"A woman can re-do the whole living

room, wallpapering and making new drapes, but the man will make a shelf for it and every time he enters the room will look at it and say, 'that's quite a shelf.'"

Mrs. Hekker, commenting on the sexual revolution, observed that "you don't prove yourself by going to bed with a man — it's getting up with him that counts."

She recalled working on her town's library sale with a 52-year-old friend who looked at a copy of "Joy of Sex" and asked if Mrs. Hekker had read it. The friend admitted she had but confided that she had hidden it from her husband. "He would be so upset if he found out what he's missed," she explained.

Terry Hekker told of marrying her husband when he was entering law school and of having the five children, now ranging from 21 to 11 years old. Her tour to publicize the books was a chance to have him accompany her, she says, adding that a family always helps keep things in perspective.

She said she had been asked if she missed adult conversation when home with children all day.

"Now nothing is so overrated as adult conversation," she said. "I had a boss who had two conversation topics — the deplorable state of the Long Island Railroad and the state of his digestive system."

"Now children ask wonderful questions, like, 'Why do you give a plant a drink when it has no mouth?'"

"I remember telling one child he had his shoes on the wrong feet and his reply was 'They're the only feet I have.'"

BUT MRS. HEKKER can be serious, too. "Teenagers need a lot more love and understanding than they'd like to let you think," she noted.

She left no doubt that she supports ERA, saying she feels it does need dif-

ferent leaders. ERA is needed, she declares, because in some states, such as New Jersey, children not the wife, inherit the husband's property unless there's a will stating otherwise.

"I think some of this 'chairperson' thing has gone too far, however, I was sure of it when I saw the sign in a hospital that read: 'This lounge reserved for pregnant persons.'"

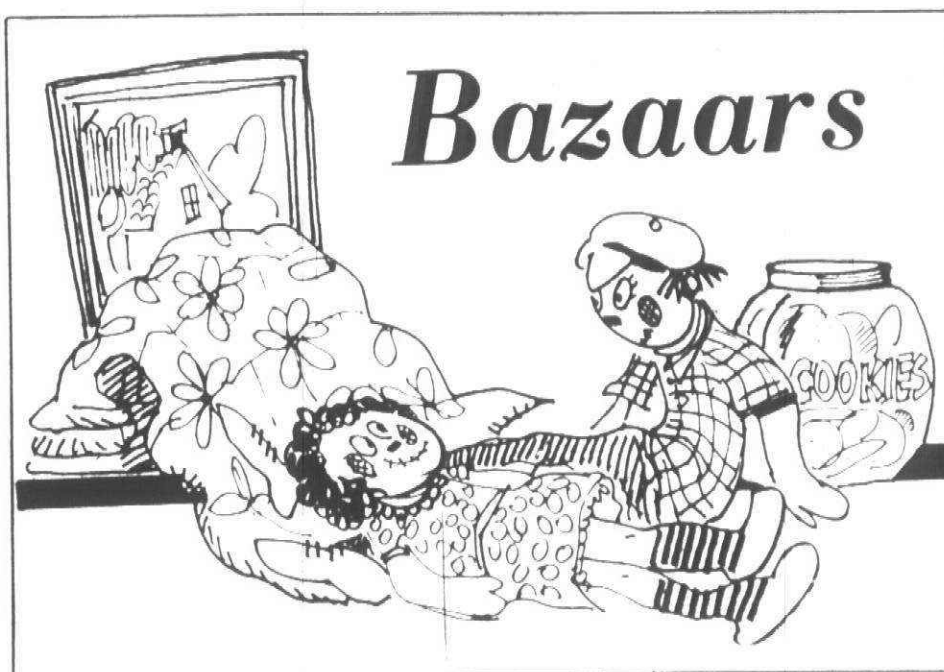

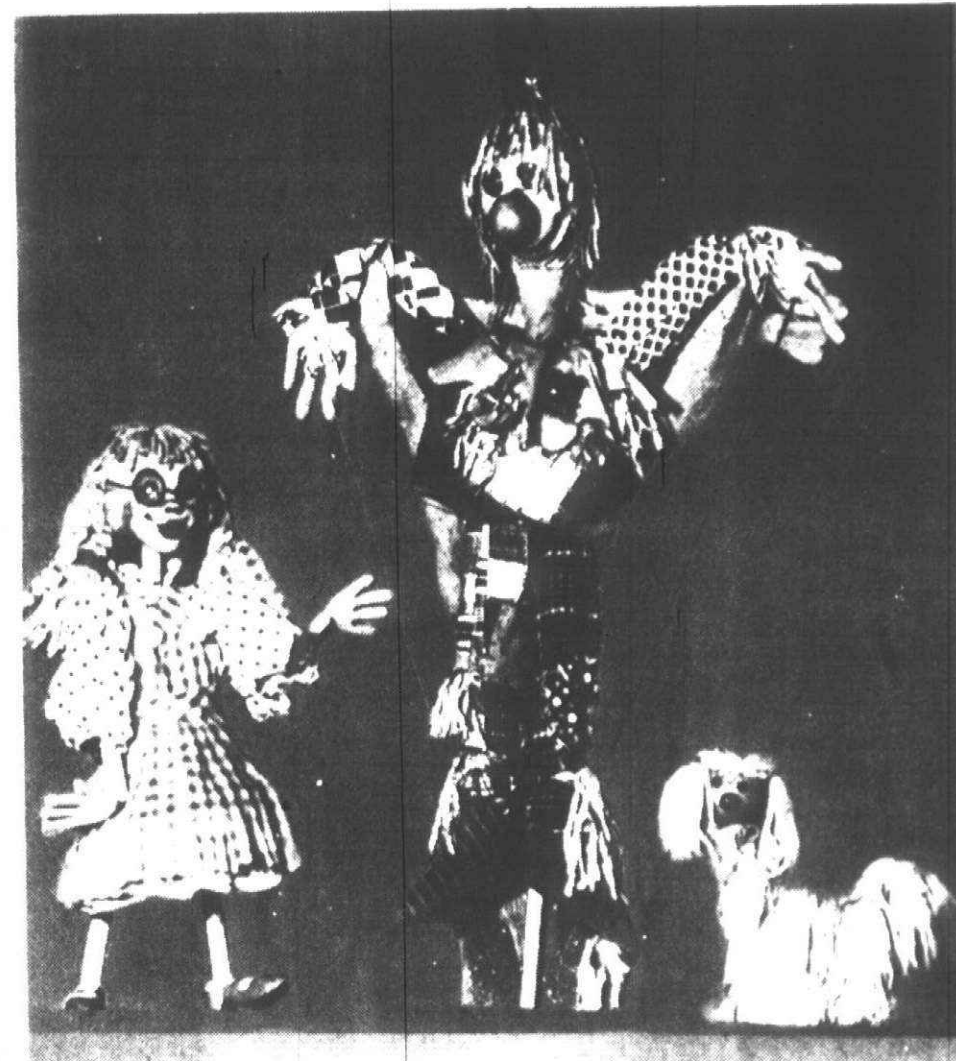
The Israeli government youth theater supports Eric's Puppet Theatre.

Predictability describes what future holds in travel

Chances are that in the next 10 years you will seriously consider buying a vacation home, as an investment and a status symbol. If you live in one of the new households added to the United States during the past decade, there is a one-in-five chance that you are single and that your travel habits reflect that.

If you are married, you probably have at least two wage-earners in your family, prompting you to explore more and shorter vacation trips, sometimes with your spouse and sometimes alone.

And if you are a kid, tough luck; there aren't as many of you around anymore and your parents won't necessarily take you with them when they travel.

I heard a lot about such changing trends when I attended the 25th annual convention of the Society of American Travel Writers in Poland recently.

The source was a speaker named Arthur Shapiro, senior vice president of the advertising firm of Yankelovich, Skelly & White Inc., who flew from New York to give us a look at an in-depth study done for the travel market.

Shapiro's firm represents such accounts as American Airlines and American Express; they spend a lot of money trying to figure out your future travel habits.

ALTHOUGH TRAVEL is slipping for the first time in 10 years as a measure of the good life, according to Shapiro, the Me Decade is definitely not over.

"The movement towards conservatism and tradition in politics is definitely not reflected in lifestyles," he said. "People who were raised on traditional values are moving back towards traditional values to some extent, but those who were not raised on them are still living by the philosophy of entitlement."

Americans raised on the work ethic saw the American dream come true after World War II, prompting them to adopt what Shapiro calls the philosophy of affluence. That meant raising children less strictly, acquiring a lot of tangible possessions and working even harder.

Their children, who learned about individualism and self-fulfillment, moved us from there into the philosophy of entitlement: If I want it, I deserve it, and I should have it, not how much does it cost a month?

The philosophy of entitlement, the right to a rich, full life, combines with other factors to have some interesting effects upon travel. Those other factors include changing economics, changing family units, a new respect for time management, a new cautiousness, a changing sense of our sophistication and a population that

is getting older, less married and less child-centered.

Changing economics means we are investing more time and money in our residences. The vacation home not only is back, it is becoming a status symbol. Entirely new kinds of families are taking more and shorter vacations.

THE NUCLEAR family describes a unit consisting of a husband who brings home the bacon, a wife who stays home and two or more children. That family was once 70 percent of the population; today it is 17 percent.

There was a 9 percent increase in the population between 1970 and 1979, but single households made up 20 percent of the increase in households during that decade.

Yankelovich, Skelly & White learned that only 4 percent of the people questioned wanted to get rid of the family, however. Most of them just wanted a new kind of family. The future will hold more childless marriages, a smaller number of children in the average family, more transient households, more homes with two wage-earners and less focus on the homemaker role by women.

Most of the people in those new kinds of households wanted a new kind of leisure, vacations without the children, different friends, separate social functions, separate vacations and separate bank accounts. People will still travel in couples, and with children, but they will travel separately as well.

The most fundamental social change seen in the 1970s, the role of women, will have the most effect upon travel. Male-female roles are blurring and the new questions are Who has the time to clean the house? And who has the time to go on vacation?

ALL OF THAT makes us look like a very experimental, pioneering people, but the survey shows that we are actually getting more cautious in a way that affects travel. We are less inclined to the exotic destination, more inclined to the well-known place.

We want low-cost experiences and less pioneering, which means more value for less risk: extended bus trips, more vacations with friends, more package tours.

At the same time, we have a new sense of our own sophistication. Elitism used to mean the difference between the haves and the have nots, but it now means the difference between the blue collar worker and the new rich.



We want to be sophisticated but we don't want to work very hard at it. We are inclined to affluence and education, not to love of learning or in-depth culture.

So here we are, folks. We are older; between 1975 and 1985 there will be 8 million less people between 5 and 19 years of age. We mistrust institutions, including travel agents and the travel industry.

The role of children has changed.

We're more sophisticated, or so we think, and more cautious. We have more money, because both mates often work, but we don't have time to spend it except in short spurts. When we were asked our opinion, 68 percent said credit cards should be controlled because we are all too weak to control ourselves. At the same time, 50 percent of us favored buying now because it will be more expensive later.

If that is contradiction, contradiction is also part of the changing American character, according to the Yankelovich accounting.

"One of the most important things we learned about the American people is that the same people are watching both 'Charlie's Angels' and the 'Lehrer Report' on television," Shapiro said.

The survey shows that we are actually getting more cautious in a way that affects travel. We are less inclined to the exotic destination, more inclined to the well-known place. We want low-cost experiences and less pioneering... more vacations with friends, more package tours.

Music is in their blood

The flags of 36 nations hang above the bust of Chopin during the international Chopin competition here in Warsaw. On the stage, the grand piano bristles with microphones as a young man from France begins to play.

He is the only moving object in the concert hall. In the audience rapt music lovers face forward across the parquet floor and over the polished balcony rail.

This is no high school competition of young pianists but a kind of world series of young concert pianists in the making.

The 180 contestants play five pieces of music each in recitals that spread across several evenings. Thirty-four of them were from the U.S., but none of the Americans were playing during the evening I attended, the third of the competition.

I am here by accident. I knew this prestigious piano competition was on in Warsaw but it never occurred to me that I could get tickets so I didn't try.

Tonight, when our tour bus returned from Zelazowa Wola, Chopin's birthplace, I walked into the concert hall just in case. There were no regular tickets but, reluctant to give up, I followed the beckoning finger of a ticket collector up the white marble staircase.

With a little German and a little French, I learned there were tickets for standing room. Upstairs, another firm but kindly ticket collector used his hands and his feet to tell me in Polish that I could enter the hall until the next contestant began.

He directed me to a nearby television set, where I watched the contestant, a Rumanian, finish the last half of his recital.

INSIDE, WHERE we lined single file against the wall, we watched and listened as a young Frenchman played. Even good music can't compete with aching feet and an armload of coats and bags, however, so at intermission I moved to the doors facing the large center aisle. I staked out a place where I could lean comfortably against the doorframe.

Within minutes I noticed that a Polish woman was beckoning to me from a nearby seat. When I did not understand her, she wordlessly extracted a folding camp stool from her large purse. I set it up gratefully in the aisle.

By the next contestant, a young man from Taiwan, I was waved to seat by another friendly Pole whose companion was leaving.

I sit her now with all those perfectly still heads in front of me, while a Chinese woman pianist makes deep velvet sounds on the piano. The audience, which is rapt and silent during the music, does not move at all until she pauses between pieces; during the pause, they all clear their throats and move their feet for the few seconds of silence. There is no clapping until her entire recital is finished.

I cannot judge the quality of this exquisite music. Nor do I want to. The flowing blouse on the arms of the Chinese pianist make a composition of its own as the sleeves move back and forth across the polished piano. All those 36 flags fly above the respectful affectionate attention of the people of Warsaw whose musical standards are among the highest in the world.

The next time you make a disparaging Polish joke, come with me in your mind to this concert hall in Warsaw, rebuilt here in the 35 years since World War II by a people who love and understand music.

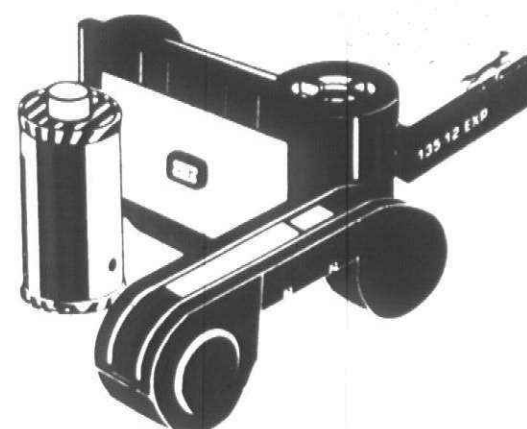

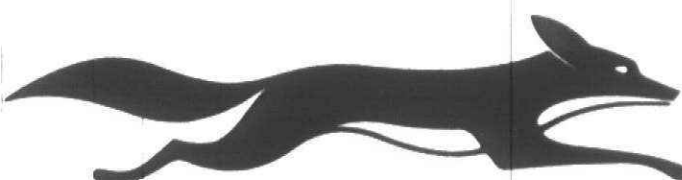

District final pits Rocks against Glenn

Host Plymouth Salem and Westland John Glenn posted lopsided semifinal wins Saturday night and will meet for the district girls' basketball crown.

In the opener, Glenn dominated Garden City West, 83-26, while Salem handled an improved Livonia Churchill quintet, 43-26.

Glenn, now sporting a 19-1 mark, will square off against the Rocks (18-4)

at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday.

The Rockets, led by senior frontliners Kim Cesarz and Geri Pizzuti, manhandled West with a full-court press.

Glenn scored almost at will in the first quarter, jumping out to a 36-4 lead.

The Rockets increased their lead to 52-12 at halftime as coach George Sommerman substituted freely.

"I'm sure they (West) weren't happy

with our full-court press," he said. "I didn't think this was a very good tune-up. It's hard to keep the kids up."

West, which finished the season at 5-15, played hard despite the insurmountable odds.

"We can be down by 30 points and our girls never quit," said West coach Pat Burke. "I think the Salem girls are more controlled. At times tonight I thought we rattled Glenn."

Cesarz, a 5-foot-10 forward, finished

with 22 points. Pizzuti added 17 and

Teri Chapo chipped in with 13. Dee Plitt, a senior, topped West with 16. Sue Ohi added eight.

SALEM HAD problems with Churchill's 2-3 zone defense in the nightcap.

The Rocks, however, got their game together in the third quarter with a 16-9 surge.

Cheryl Sobkow paced the winners with 12 points. Teammates Jan MacK-

enzie and Eileen Moore each had 10.

"I have a lot of respect for Glenn since I've played them twice," said Churchill coach Don Albertson. "I'm not going to pick a winner."

"The more it's a slow-down game, the more Salem will be in the running. They moved the ball around well against our zone and Sobkow commanded the boards. Plymouth Salem is a well-disciplined, poised team."

Sophomore guard Janine Cerroni, who was instrumental in Churchill's 8-6

first quarter lead, finished with 10 points.

"I thought we played a pretty good game after beating Canton the other night (37-36)," said Salem coach Bob Blohm. "We were still a little tired because we played so hard."

"You have to be concerned about playing Glenn. They are physically strong and can score in a lot of ways."

The game will be broadcast on WSDP radio (88.1 FM) beginning at 7:25 p.m.

Patient Salem rallies to down Chiefs, 37-36

In a classic confrontation, Plymouth Salem ousted rival Plymouth Canton

Thursday night from the girls' state prep tournament, 37-36, before a large crowd at the Salem gym.

The Rocks' victory snapped Canton's

17-game winning streak.

Eileen Moore's free throw with 22 seconds left won it for Salem. Her charity toss broke a 36-all deadlock.

Canton, which finished the season at 18-3, never was able to get off the go-ahead shot in the final 22 seconds.

Salem center Cheryl Sobkow came up with the defensive play of the night, blocking Susie Pierce's attempt with five seconds to go. On the block, Canton's Colleen Crissey forced a jump ball with Sobkow.

To the circle just of the Chiefs' hoop, Salem coach Bob Blohm called a timeout.

When play resumed, Sobkow, standing nine inches taller than Crissey, tapped the ball out to center court as time expired.

"In a game like that there are no losers," said Blohm, whose team is now 17-4. "I can't say enough about both teams."

"We were down at halftime and I told our girls to slow it down a little more. The scoring opportunities were there. It was no time to panic."

The district opener produced two contrasting styles of play.

Salem is more deliberate while Canton likes the running game.

The Chiefs, backed by their vocal following, jumped out to a 23-17 halftime lead.

CINDY SOVINE'S rebound basket with 6:48 to play gave Canton its biggest lead of the night, 25-18.

But shortly after things began to go Salem's way.

"We couldn't get the running game going," said a disappointed coach Mike McCauley, "and that's why we didn't get any points."

"In the second half we wanted to get it under control even more," said

Blohm. "In the first half we weren't sending anybody to the glass."

Salem began to chip away near the end of the third quarter as Canton fell back into a zone defense.

A key play occurred when Jan MacKenzie stole the ball and converted a layup after a missed free throw with 6:02 remaining. That basket put the Rocks on top, 34-31.

Canton, however, came back 18 seconds later on a basket by Jean Timlin and a free throw by Pearly Cunningham.

Both teams traded misses until the 4:02 mark when Moore banked in a rebound shot to put Salem up, 36-34.

With 2:49 left, Salem went into a semi-stall and held possession for almost two minutes.

Canton got the ball back on a turnover, but forward Reggie Ruggiero was called for a charging foul with 53 seconds left. Moore went down to the other end and missed the free throw, giving

the Chiefs another chance.

McCauley called timeout with 35 seconds left. When play resumed, Ruggiero grabbed a rebound and scored, knotting the count at 36.

Five seconds later, Ruggiero fouled Moore in the backcourt, setting up the game-winner.

Moore, after canning the first shot, missed the second as Pierce grabbed the rebound. McCauley then called another timeout, his last, to set up a play.

That was proceeded by another timeout, this time by Blohm, who wanted to check Canton's out-of-bounds alignment.

CANTON WORKED the ball around to Pierce, whose attempt was snuffed out.

"We wanted to get the ball to Cunningham in the corner," explained McCauley. "We just didn't get it down there."

Blohm was simply ecstatic over the thrilling win.

"If somebody told me that we'd be 17-4 at this time I'd tell them they're crazy," he said. "I think we have a good chance to win it now."

"Tonight we just kept playing hard. (Eileen) Moore is a three-year player who has been in this situation before."

The scenario rarely changes for the Western Six League girls' swim meet.

"We did real well as far as taking the right places," said Canton coach Mark Griffith. "Our competition was Harrison and we beat them by almost 100 points."

"I'm real pleased. This is the best finish ever for Plymouth Canton. We had a lot of depth that helped."

Don't ignore the brakes

Like too many parts on a car, the brakes are often neglected because they are so reliable and durable.

After a car has been slowed and stopped many thousands of times, the brake linings or disc pads will wear out, but this happens so gradually that the driver may not be sensitive to the changes that result.

Therefore, brakes should be inspected at least once a year, and the fluid level in the master cylinder should be checked at least every 5,000 miles, says the Automotive Information Council.

If a lining is allowed to wear through, the metal rivets or a portion of the brake shoe may scrape or score the brake drum. This will result in the need for reconditioning or replacement.

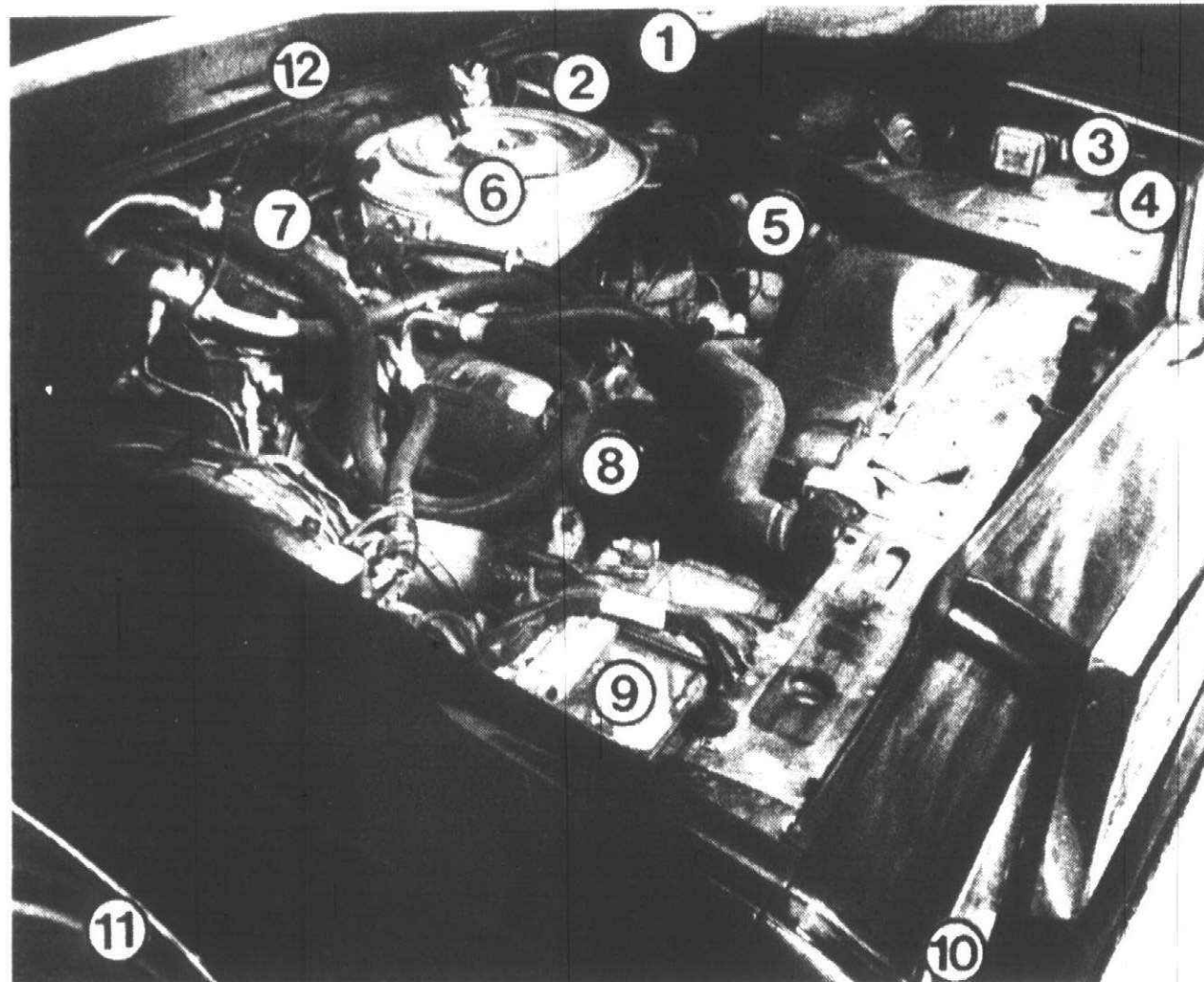
More than any other factor, your driving habits affect the life of your car's brakes, so unless you have to make a sudden stop as a safety precaution,

don't slam on the brakes. Also, try to anticipate stops, not only to save the wear on the brakes but on the tires as well.

Don't "ride" the brakes when driving. That practice also causes premature wear. It does nothing for fuel mileage, either.

Because brake wear is so gradual, the following items may tip you off to the need for brake repair or inspection:

- Brakes pull car to one side — This indicates worn linings, fluid on the linings or worn suspension parts.
- Brakes chatter — A drum is out-of-round, a lining is loose or a disc is warped.
- Metallic grinding when stopping — Brake shoes or pads worn completely through.
- Spongy brake pedal — The brake system is low on fluid or there is air in the hydraulic lines.
- Pedal goes almost to the floor — The brake system needs more brake fluid.



Winter checkpoints

A good winter check list includes these 12 items: 1. Motor oil dipstick — check level. 2. Master cylinder — check brake fluid level. 3. Windshield washer reservoir — keep it full. 4. Radiator — check coolant level and antifreeze strength. 5. Power steering fluid dipstick — check level. 6. Air filter — replace if dirty. 7. Automatic transmission fluid dip-

stick — check level with motor running. 8. Belts — test tension and replace if frayed or cracked. 9. Battery — clean terminals and check fluid level. 10. Lights, turn signals — be sure they work. 11. Tires — check pressure and wear. 12. Windshield wipers — replace if worn.

Kiwanis fruitcake sale, a tradition in Plymouth

It takes a lot of friends to sell a lot of fruitcakes — and Clarence Moore, 85, has had the fortune to charm enough friends over the years to remain the Plymouth Kiwanis Club's top salesman in its annual Christmas Drive.

Beginning Nov. 1 of each year, the evening Kiwanis group of the Plymouth community kicks off its two-month drive to sell enough cakes to keep its club humming throughout the year.

Moore, a 43-year member of that club, has sold an estimated 20,750 since the group began promoting its cakes 21 years ago.

A retired sheep farmer in Plymouth, who was one of the main founders of a local metal stamping company (1932-72), Moore can boast that he's sold as many as 1,575 cakes in one season alone.

What does it take?

"First of all you have to have a good product," says Moore. "Then you have to have a certain personality, and then you have to make contacts."

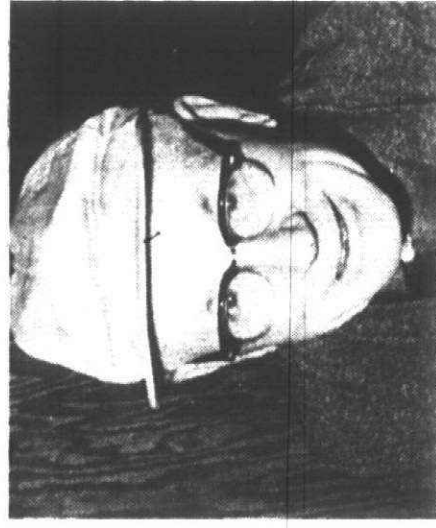
The part about making "contacts," apparently comes easy for the less-than-bashful sheep farmer.

Just recently Moore was entering a store in Plymouth, carrying a fruitcake in each hand, when he tapped an unsuspecting potential customer. She bought both.

"Some people say — I can't ask someone to buy a fruitcake. I say: why can't you?"

"Like this lady. If I hadn't spoken up, she wouldn't have asked for them."

Proceeds from the Kiwanis fruitcake sale are used year-round for special proj-

ects. The service organization's work can be witnessed around the community.

The brick sidewalk surrounding Kellogg Park was paid for with Kiwanis contributions as was the sprinkler system and shrubbery around Central Middle School. Those proceeds were also used to send Boys and girls from the community to Boy's State in Lansing. The club has been able to purchase a truck at \$7,000 for the Plymouth Fire and Drum Corps as well as one for the Salvation Army.

The cakes, which sold for \$33.25 20 years ago, sell for \$5.25 today. And if you ask Moore, he'll tell you that's a bargain.

"A \$2 increase in 20 years is pretty good."

The fruitcakes, baked in Athens, Ga., are sold only to service clubs at wholesale prices.

"I've even had people, two-three months after Christmas ask for them," says Moore.

The deadline for the fruitcake sale is this week.

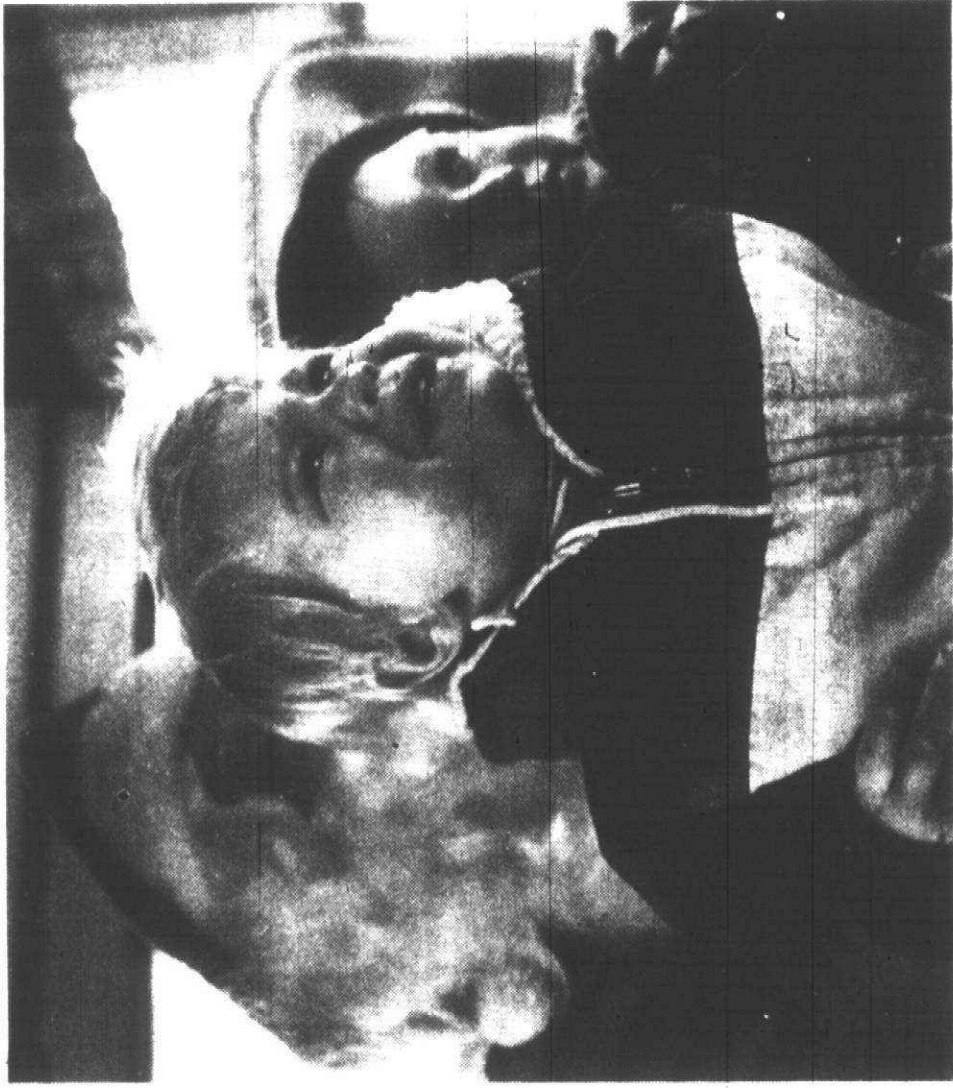

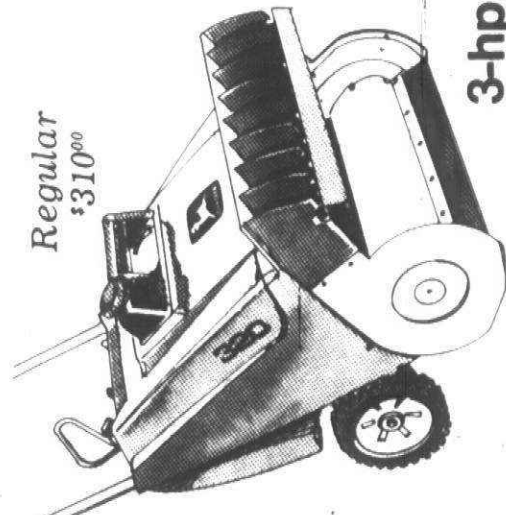

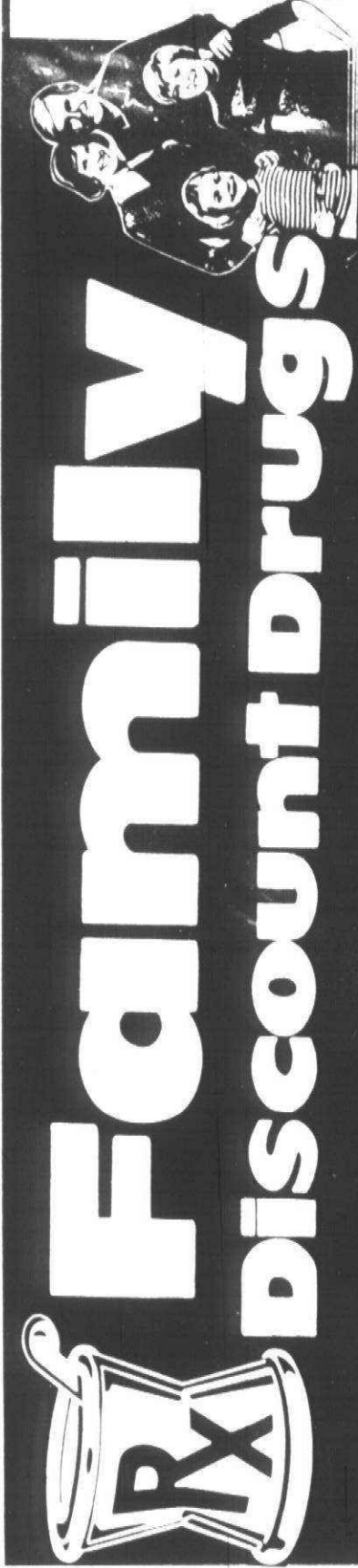

breadboxes, and plant holders.

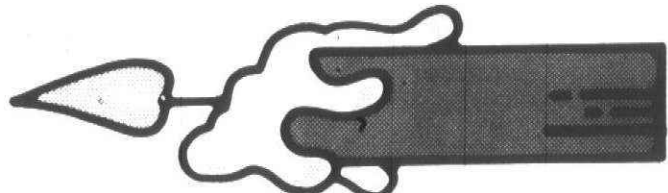

William and Elaine Doughty of Plymouth Township will have hand-made wooden toys as well as knitted items.

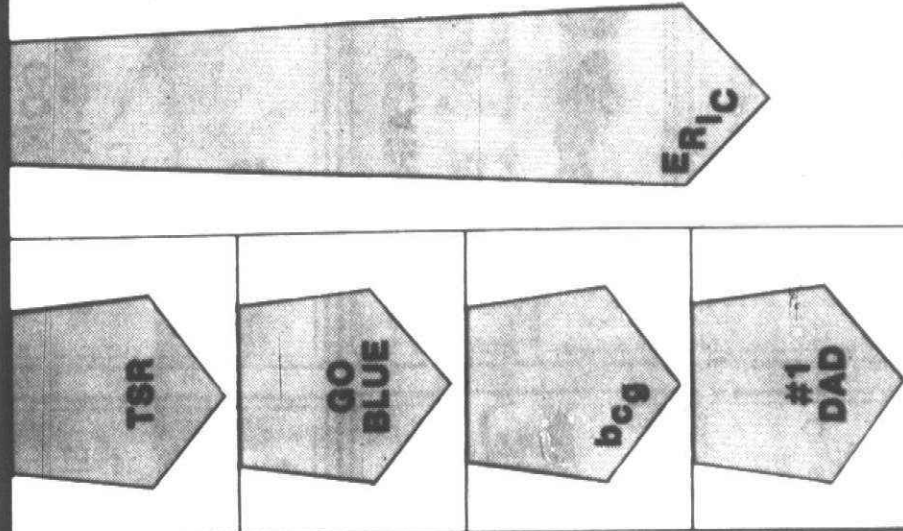

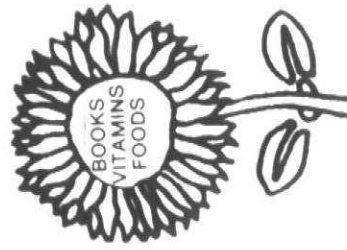


Happy Holidays

 - After your child has had a chance to play with the puzzle, he may wish to give it away or send it to a friend.

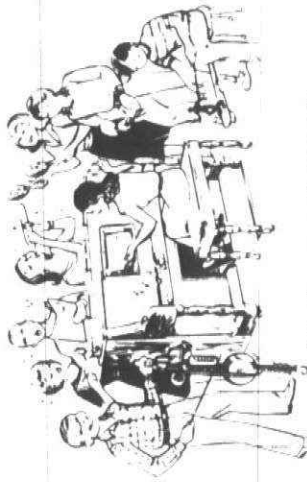

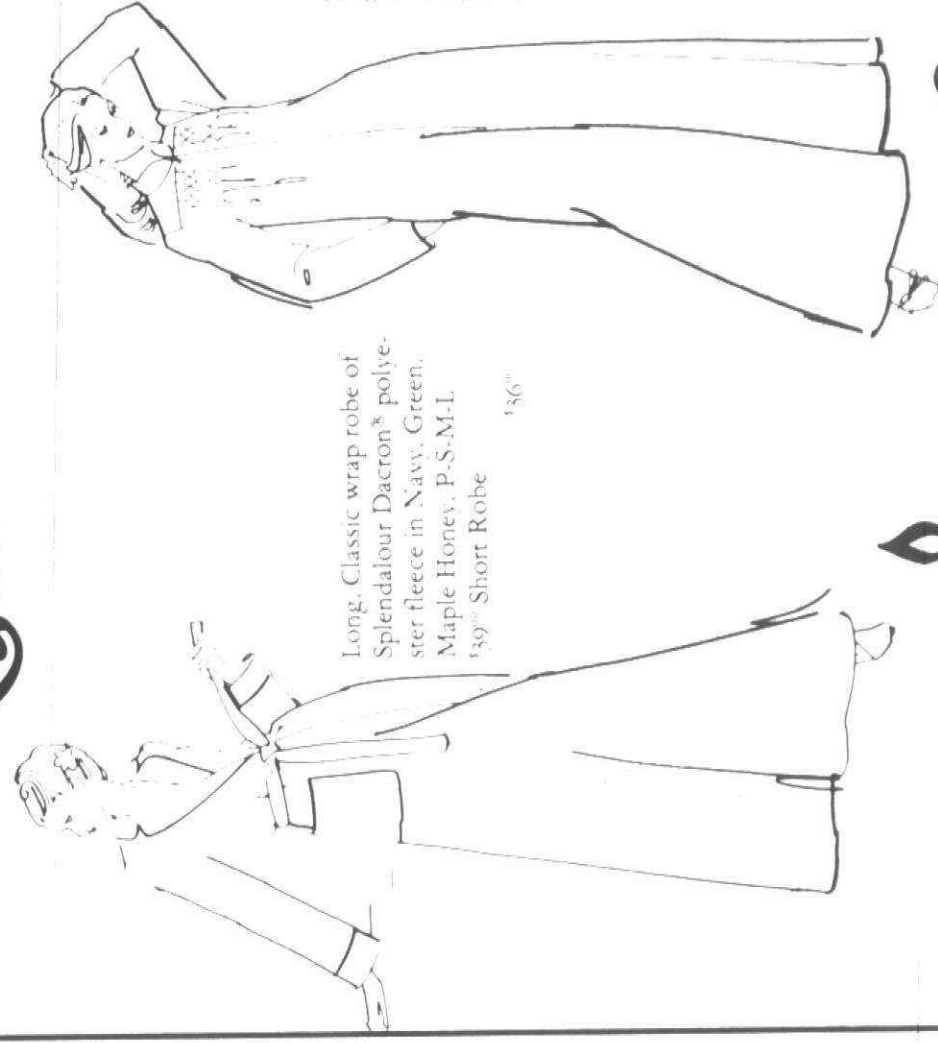
Spain: Spanish children fill their shoes with carrots and hay. They leave them outside on Epiphany Eve to refresh the camels of the Three Kings on their journey.

Poland: A meal is prepared with a place left for the Christ Child. After the meal, the Star Man (usually the village priest disguised or a well-informed neighbor) quizzes the children on their catechism. Correct answers win a gift.

China: There are many religions practiced here, including Buddhism, Taoism, Confucianism and Christianity. In the Christian tradition, children decorate a tree with lantern lights. Children hang up stockings and hope that Sheng Dan Lao Ren (Christmas Old Man) will fill them with toys, candy and fruit.
