Schools schedule mill vote; weigh bond issue try

Three elections in two months may be facing voters in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The school board already has decided to hold a millage renewal election on Thursday, Jan. 22.

And thought presently is being given to holding a second special election on Thursday, March 26, to seek voter approval of a bond issue to finance added classroom space.

The third election, required by state law, is the annual school board election on Tuesday, June 2, to elect school trustees.

The ballot request in January is to renew 10.36 mills (\$10.36 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation) now being levied for a period of six years.

The renewal mills generate operating funds and cannot be spent on providing space for additional students.

To find space for the large number of new students the elementary level is feeding into the middle schools and high schools, the school board is now

studying a ballot issue for bonded funds.

LAST WEDNESDAY in a workshop study session, the administration presented the school board with a bond issue proposal totalling some \$2.5 million.

After some discussion, trustees directed the administration to scale down the request to somewhere between \$1.3 and \$1.5 million.

That was done by deleting from the proposed bond issue some \$500,000 for purchase of buses and about \$400,000 for the purchase of portable classrooms.

The school board is hoping to come up with a bond proposal which won't result in any additional millage if approved by voters.

The district now is levying 3.12 mills for debt retirement. The current debt levy is being collected to pay off the debt from the bond issue which fi-

Officials tabulate special vote cost

The special election Jan. 22 to seek approval of a school millage renewal will cost about \$4,500.

Dr. John M. Hoben adds that the election would cost more except the district will be using paper ballots rather than voting machines.

"We are holding a special election in January so we can plan in an orderly manner for the next school year," says Hoben. "This will allow planning to take place knowing what the minimum levels of local tax revenues will be."

"Also, if we don't know until June what funds are available for 1981-82, we lose valuable time for hiring or replacing teachers, ordering materials, and arranging schedules."

THE ELECTION on Thursday, Jan. 22, seeks voter approval of 10.36 mills now being collected for operational expenses.

If approved, the 10.36 mills \$10.36

per \$1,000 state equalized valuation would be collected for six years.

The 10.36 mills represents about \$10 million in income or 25 percent of the district's total operating revenues.

Because the proposal is to renew existing millage, Hoben stresses, passage would not result in any change in the millage rate for taxpayers.

Hoben added that he cannot guarantee that there won't be any cuts in programs if the renewal passes. Cuts in school programs will really be decided, he added, on the state school aid legislation for 1981-82.

The district has arranged its millage so that a renewal comes up every other year rather than annually. The present schedule results in the 10.36 mills expiring in 1980, eight mills expiring in 1982, eight mills in 1984, and 10.36 mills in 1986.

For the owner of a \$70,000 home defeat of the renewal would result in a tax savings per year of about \$363.

Cable plugs in But most wait for arrival of new type of TV

Paul Kesson has viewed "Alien" three times in the last two weeks.

"I love that movie. That's my favorite so far," said Paul, 19, whose family is one of only seven in Canton with cable television services.

"I never watched that much TV before. But cable is really interesting," said Paul. "We always have a crowd in the family room — sometime 15 or 16 people at one time. My dad says that he's going to collect a quarter from every one."

THE BULK of Canton's residents will have to wait until next spring or summer — or even the warm days of 1982 — before hooking up to the cable TV system.

But seven families who live on Orhan in the Holiday Park subdivision are watching movie, sports and other specialty channels of Omnicom's cable system.

Omnicom — the firm contracted for cable in Canton and the Plymouth communities — had not expected to serve any homes in Canton so soon. Work is now underway to construct the system in Plymouth and Plymouth Township — which approved their cable contracts before Canton.

A handful of Orhan residents happened to live in the right spot of Canton as area construction work progressed.

A main cable line was strung near the street in northeast Canton last month. Omnicom vice president Jeff Dorn said the aerial line carries signals from a reception site in Westland to Plymouth.

"We were coming up from Westland and we were by there anyway," said Dorn. "We just thought why not hook these homes up along the way."

Gale Owens, one of the Canton residents with cable TV said her family has entertained extra company during the last few weeks. "It's only on our side of the street," she said. "People call

us up to find out what's on. Our neighbors across the street have been over several times to watch movies with us."

THE OWENS' neighbors in Holiday Park subdivision near Joy and Interstate 275 are next on line to get cable. Dorn said the system may be activated on other streets in Holiday Park this winter.

The subdivision is one of the few areas in Canton with overhead utility lines. Omnicom follows the route of existing utilities while installing lines for the cable system.

The cold weather has daunted construction of an underground cable system, which will serve most of Canton. Dorn hopes to begin underground work in Canton next spring.

But the work probably will take more than one season, he said. Cable television may be unavailable to some Canton residents until the spring or summer of 1982.

He declined to say which areas of Canton would receive cable first.

"As you build an area, you activate it," said. At the present time, Omnicom is working to increase the capability of its system from 40 to 50 channels. The system which currently serves seven families in Canton and about 500 in Plymouth and Plymouth Township offers 33 programmed channels and seven blank.

"There's new stuff coming on the satellite," Dorn said of the expansion plan.

Subscribers pay \$15 a month for a total cable package under Omnicom's contract with Canton. The charge covers fees for regular cable channels — offering sports, children's, news, local origination and other types of programming — as well as Home Box Office, a first-run movie service.

SINCE CABLE was activated on Orhan last month, subscribers have viewed a variety of movies such as "Superman," "Alien," "The Muppet Movie" and "Going in Style."

"We enjoy it," said Mrs. Owens, whose family includes husband James and three kids, 2, 5 and 7. "We don't get out to the show that often. We figured, in the long run, it would be cheaper to get cable TV."

"I've stayed up later than I normally I do," she added. "It's strange. There are no commercials. You keep waiting for a commercial to get up and get a drink."

Remorse plagues shoplifters—after arrest

They cry when they're caught.

They envision loss of job or a chance for a career. They become terrified of disgrace or of going to jail.

"Please don't tell my husband or children (or parents)," they beg.

"They" are shoplifters — people who have been caught tucking an item into a purse or pocket, hoping to slip out of a store without paying for it.

"They" are persons who try to get a "bargain" by switching a price tag.

OFFICIALS — police, judges and security personnel — say shoplifters cross all age and economic lines. They shoplift on a dare or a whim, or because they're bidding for attention, officials add.

And, while shoplifting goes on year-round, "it always increases around the holidays," notes Canton Police Lt. Larry Stewart.

Stores are crammed with goodies of all type and price range. Shoppers are out in force.

"It's sheer numbers," adds Stewart. "Here is an opportunity to do it (and) it may not be a conscious thing."

"Part of it is the way merchants display," says Judge James Garber, of the 35th District Court which includes Plymouth, Canton and Northville.

"They (products) are all out there, very available," adds Garber. "That is part of the problem. It's a very serious problem for the merchants."

Garber and Stewart say favorite targets of shoplifters in the Plymouth-Canton area are Kmart locations, and Meijer's Thrifty Acres at Ford and Canton Center roads. Major supermarkets are also frequently hit by shoplifters.

THE GROUP of shoplifters may include an occasional senior citizen, such as the retired couple who came before Garber on a charge of shoplifting delmonico steaks from Kroger.

But Garber says more common are persons between 17-20 years, both male and female, and women "in their 40s on up" who steal because they are

experiencing domestic problems. Shoplifters also may pay for some items and steal others.

"I have been told (younger shoplifters) go through a shoe department, stealing new shoes and leaving their old shoes behind," says Garber. "We don't get professional store-boasting

out here. At least I haven't seen it."

Carl Nelson says shoplifters are a "very frustrating" part of business. Nelson for the past 12 years has been with the security department of Meijer's, headquartered in Grand Rapids.

Nelson points out that shoplifting is a

"community problem."

"We have always taken a tough stand on theft of any kind," adds Nelson. "To remain competitive, we have to do it."

"It's a crime against the public," continues Nelson. "We feel we owe it to the customer."

'Tis the season to be extra wary

Sticky Fingers snatches more than candy bars and \$2 tubes of lipstick from enticing store counters.

Sticky Fingers looks like any customer including the little old lady with the ever-ready change purse. But it's a big deal when the retailer loses and the consumer pays. And the Christmas season is the time to be especially wary.

How does a shoplifter bilk a storeowner of merchandise valued from \$2 to \$3,000 in one looting spree? How does he or she get away with expensive watches, jewelry, leather and suede coats or palm

little items and stuff them in his or her pockets?

THERE ARE NUMEROUS techniques — devious, ingenious, simple, police say. Retail merchants learn a few of these methods and how to avoid them through seminars and documentary films presented by police and shopping center security departments.

Merchants are warned to keep expensive items in well-secured nooks and crannies. Sticky Fingers may shove prize pickings in empty boxes if tempting goodies are displayed on counters.

Shoppers have been known to put booster cages under their maternity tops to appear pregnant. Others

carry booster shopping bags filled with old, wrinkled bags, the better to stock with merchandise.

SHOPLIFTERS wear clothes several sizes too large, so they can slip stolen duds underneath their baggy wear. A successful technique is called crotching. It is Sticky Finger's jargon and it means placing ripped-off goods between the thighs.

Dressing rooms are common areas where shoplifters are able to conceal stolen clothes. Employees counting garments taken into rooms may be one step ahead of the shoplifter. Senso-matic price

Area Boy Scouts earn Eagle rank

Economic Recovery '81

Don't hold your breath for the good times yet

The 1981 economic outlook seems to be: "Wait 'til 1982."

Recovery from the deep 1980 recession will be slight until later in the new year, and any exuberance should be saved for another year.

That picture — neither optimistic nor pessimistic — emerged from business leaders discussing the overall economy and the auto industry at a packed Detroit Economic Club luncheon Monday in Cobo Hall.

PAUL TIPPETT Jr., president of American Motors Corp., Southfield, and Dr. Marina von N. Whitman, vice president and chief economist of General Motors Corp., said 1981's recovery won't follow textbook rules.

"In a cyclical business such as the auto industry, one expects the sales curve will bounce back right after it hits bottom," said Tippet. "But that won't necessarily be the case in 1981."

The reason: high credit costs and other "imponderables."

On an \$8,100 four-year car loan, a 16-percent bank loans cost the buyer \$900 more than a 12 percent rate. Tack that on top of high sticker prices, and the picture is scary to buyers, he said.

And high interest rates are particularly tough on dealers, Tippet said, because "dealers are in a terrible dilemma. To keep their finance costs down, they must reduce their inventories to bare bones. But when they reduce their inventories to bare bones, the lose a lot of sale, because they don't have the right cars in stock."

THE AMC president said the industry consensus (four manufacturers and eight major suppliers) is that 10 million passenger cars and four million trucks will be sold in 1981, up 11 percent over the 1980 model year.

"Of the industry's 1981 car estimate, 7.5 million cars are expected to be domestic makes, and 2.5 million will be imports."

"For the truck estimate, we came up with about 2.5 million domestic trucks, 500,000 imports," he said.

The picture meant imports would decline 1 or 2 percent from their current 27 percent of the market.

DR. WHITMAN, assessing the overall economic picture, agreed continued high interest rates and inflation would block a textbook recovery from the recession.

"The high level of inflationary expectations that is becoming increasingly embedded in our economic structure is bringing about profound changes in traditional relationships," she said, citing:

- "Savings rates are down substantially from their historical averages."

- "Credit usage has increased significantly."

- "Inflation premiums on fixed-interest debt instruments have soared."

"There is a growing recognition of the need for more consistent anti-inflationary monetary and fiscal policies."

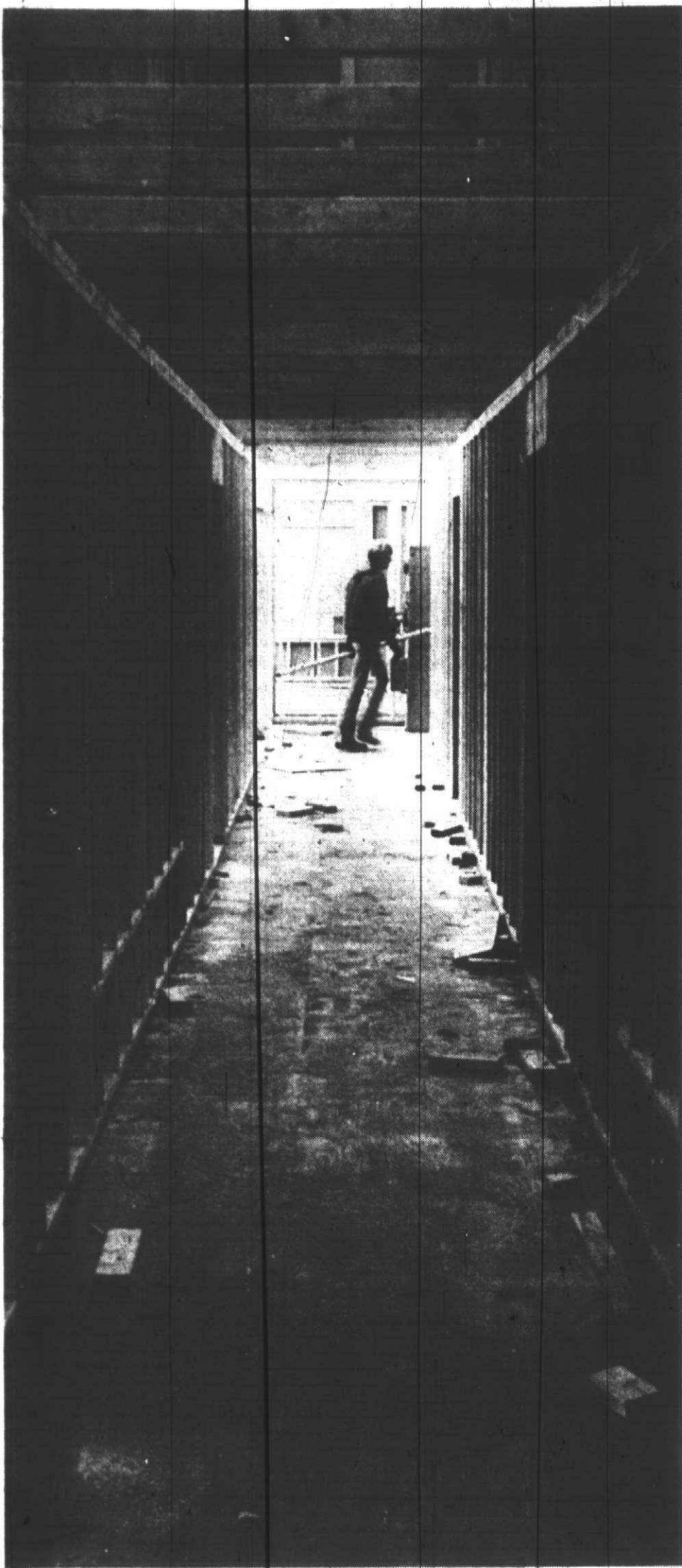
THE FEDERAL Reserve Bank's April 1980 decision to clamp down on consumer credit sent the economy into a tailspin, Whitman said, but consumer confidence has rebounded.

"There has been a significant rebuilding of consumer liquidity" since the credit clamps. "On the liability side of the consumer's balance sheet, there has been a sharp curtailment in debt usage. . . . Real net worth is at a record level."

Growth in the "real" gross national

product — as contrasted with the dollar GNP — will be flat in early 1981, but gradual recovery will follow, she predicted. She sees a 2-3 percent growth in real GNP from the end of 1980 to the end of '81.

In addition, businesses will rebuild inventories, because their stocks are low, and this will aid recovery. "Many U.S. businesses are not following the traditional practice of deferring major expenditures until the economy is operating close to capacity," she added. "The anticipated tax cut (under the Reagan Administration) is likely to provide further support for capital spending."

Building industry rarin' to go; but financing is holding it back

The construction industry is looking forward to recovery after a "disastrous" 1980. But the long-term loans which normally support construction may be hard to find.

Those contradictory pictures were drawn by a contractor and a banker when they spoke Monday at the annual economic outlook luncheon of the Detroit Economic Club.

Lawrence C. Dailey, president of R.E. Dailey & Co., is looking forward to business capital spending on "re-industrialization," new offices and new houses to satisfy pent-up demand. Dailey is also president of the Detroit chapter of Associated General Contractors of America.

BUT A GLOOMY picture of the capital market was painted by Robert M. Surdam, chairman and chief executive officer of National Bank of Detroit.

Characterizing credit markets as "turbulent," Surdam said:

"In the longer-term credit markets, we have witnessed a growing reluctance, even an inability, by many investors, personal and institutional, to commit funds to long-term fixed-rate bonds and mortgage loans. This is a natural result of the

highly inflationary environment in which we now find ourselves."

Surdam predicted "a higher and more volatile interest rate pattern in the 1980s" because:

- Banks will seek "interest rate sensitivity between their assets and liabilities." There will be "greater competition for deposits," and interest rate fluctuations will be passed onto borrowers more quickly.

- Savers are hesitant to invest in long-term, fixed-rate assets because of inflation. New debt issues will carry shorter maturities and/or variable interest rates.

- Companies are showing a propensity to finance new plants, equipment and working capital with debt (loans, bonds) rather than equity (shares of stock).

"This may be resulting in a tendency to make our economy more vulnerable to credit crunches," the NBD president said.

DAILEY'S PICTURE of the construction industry — "our nation's largest single business" — was the most optimistic of any of the five economic forecasts heard by some 1,200 leaders of business in southeast Michigan.

While construction contracts in 1980 plummeted 15 percent (\$26 billion) from 1979, he predicted "an increase in the contract value for all construction in 1981 of between 12 and 15 percent. However, this would result in real growth of only 3 to 6 percent, depending on inflation."

Business investment — "The decade of the 1980s is already being called the decade of re-industrialization, with new emphasis on supply-side economics (as opposed to consumer demand stimulation)." Conversion from oil to coal, power plant construction and major investments in synthetic fuels will help construction.

Offices — "One of the bright spots in 1980 and '81. . . . Office construction will grow by approximately 10 percent in 1981 due to continued demand for prime office space."

Residential — It will "increase significantly with housing starts expected to increase by 30 percent to 1.7 million units from this year's 1.3 million. This remains significantly below the generally accepted level of two million units."

There were some bad spots, however, in Dailey's forecast. Shopping

centers, commercial building and institutions (schools and hospitals) will stay at the 1980 level. Highways, bridges and utilities will show little increase and in Michigan will be down.

CHRISTMAS may show a pickup for retail activity, said B.M. Fauber, president and chief executive officer of Kmart Corp.

"The first reason is that I believe American consumers did a very good job this past spring and summer in correcting their balance sheets — that is, reducing their debt levels relative to income. Consumers caught the message of the Federal Reserve last March when it imposed its versions of credit controls," said the Kmart chief.

"The second reason is a significant improvement in consumer confidence and buying plans."

"In the second half of the year, after the long-heralded tax cuts finally materialize, the true recovery should begin with the ensuing four to six quarters registering a very healthy 3-4 percent growth."

Fauber called the outlook good for durable consumer goods.

No advertisements makes cable particularly attractive to Cheryl Hensel, another Orhan resident with cable TV. "The kids don't see the commercials. That's one thing I dread at Christmas time," she said.

Paul Kesson enjoys sports broadcasts from Madison Square Gardens and watching movies "over and over again."

"They put movies on at different times for all kinds of working people," Barbara Kopko, whose family subscribes to cable for movies and sports broadcasts, included some negative comments in her assessment of cable TV.

"One station showed what I thought was an X-rated movie on 1 p.m. on Sunday. It sent me through the roof," said Mrs. Kopko, who has two children, ages 9 and 6. "It made me realize that the regular channels have really cleaned up on the violence."

Keys are available to shut off a particular channel, she added. Cable guides also note the ratings of movies.

"I'm worried about a babysitter who may come over at night? she said. "I don't think their parents would appreciate it."

"But I am watching TV more now. I literally didn't watch it all before — except maybe Channel 56 and an occasional movie. I read a lot."

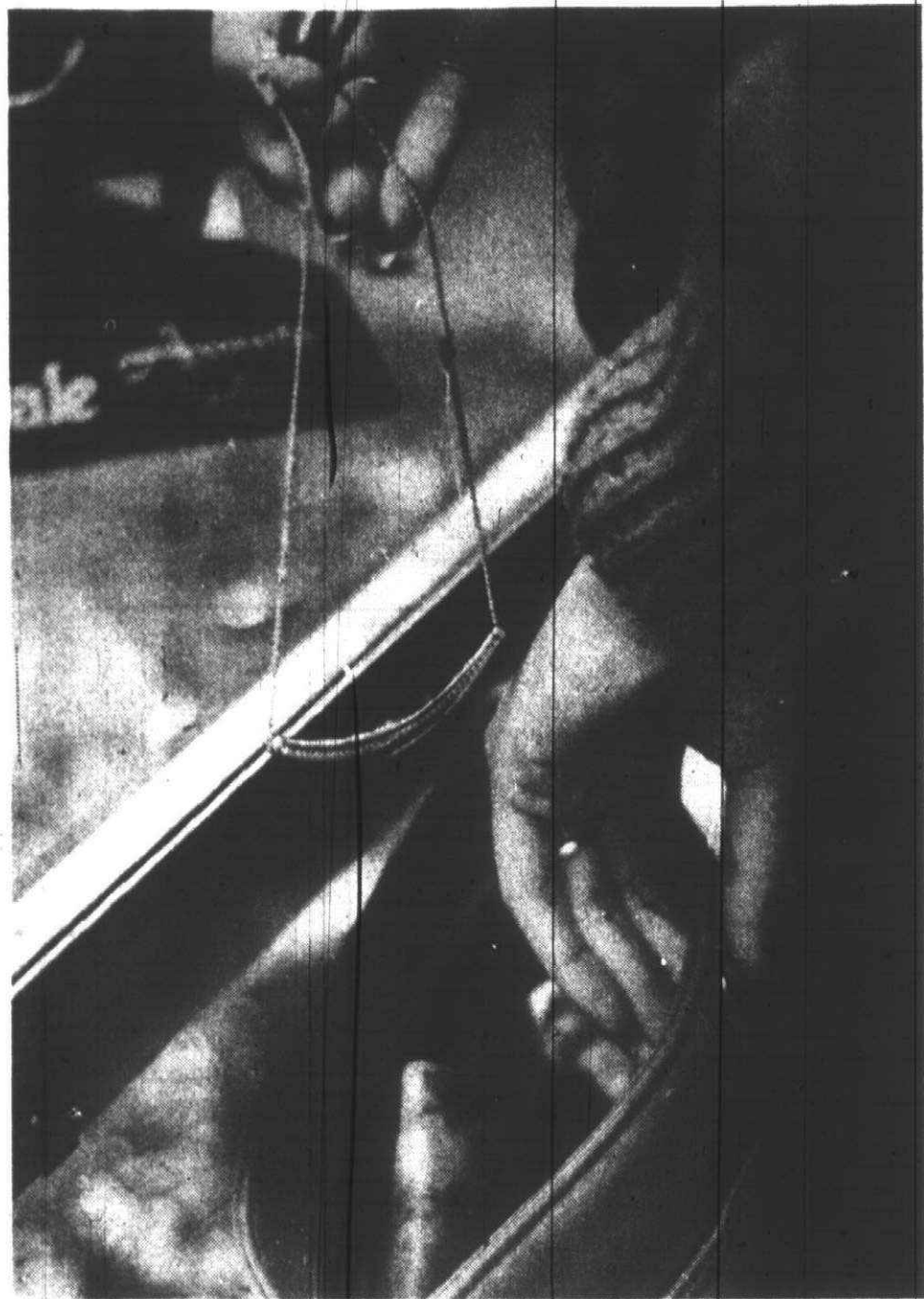

Nelson says the Meijer's chain uses plain-clothes security personnel and mirrors placed in strategic places to discourage would-be shoplifters. The company also emphasizes "good customer service and attention."

"It's more a self-service organization," adds Nelson. "But while they (clerks and stock persons) are (working) we hope they will be attentive to what is going on around them."

SO FAR this year, Canton police have processed about 55 shoplifting complaints. That compares to a total of 76 cases for all of last year.

But Stewart says those figures aren't a complete reflection of the incidence of shoplifting. He pointed out that stores also may be logging complaints through other agencies which have jurisdiction, such as the Wayne County Sheriff's Department or the Michigan State Police.

Shoplifting falls under the category of larceny.

Whether persons are charged under misdemeanor or felony classifications often depends on the value of the goods and prior convictions, says

For example, larceny in a building is a felony punishable by five years in prison upon conviction. That usually is reserved for thefts over \$100 in value.

Items valued less than \$100 usually would fall under a misdemeanor category of simple larceny, which carry penalties of fines or brief prison sentences.

Garber says the court often requires shoplifters to make restitution. They might also be required to pay a fine and to take part in a work program, performing such chores as washing police cars, trimming grass and weeds, etc.

Others are placed on probation and are counseled by a probation officer.

"OFTEN they have no prior criminal record," says Garber. "Potentially, they have ruined their lives."

"Unless they are conning me, they are remorseful — if only for the reason that they are caught," continues Garber.

"(Merchants) aren't after their pound of flesh," adds Garber. "On the other hand, they have to protect themselves."

tags which buzz when clothes are taken out of the store is another deterrent.

The professional, or even the well-practiced amateur often operates as part-shoplifter, part-con artist. The con artist skill comes to the fore when he or she successfully finagles a refund check, with no proof of purchase, from a store employee. It becomes even more of a coup when the check is mailed.

THE PROFESSIONAL shoplifter may damage merchandise he or she just heisted from a rack and have it repaired by an in-house repair service. That means a free ride out of the store. Employees should check rush orders for repair with no sales receipt.

First you look at the purse may be but a sweet refrain from an old Motown hit, but the sure tip-off, the sure give-away, is Sticky Finger's eyes, police experts say. Employees are advised to watch customers with eyes on the move.

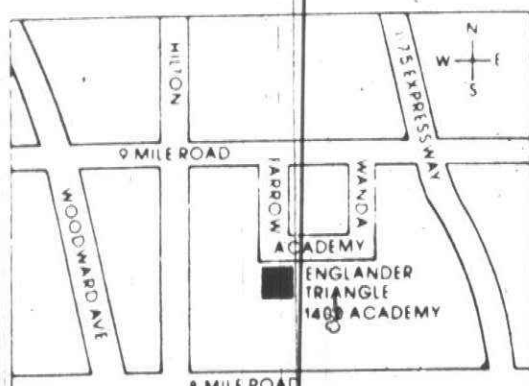

Lennon's death strikes responsive chord

John Lennon's words and music struck a responsive chord in millions. His sudden and unreasonable death has struck another chord.

Throughout the metropolitan area, people went on with their lives. But for the last few days they went on while talking about John Lennon, the Beatles, their music, and the loss of a man of Lennon's abilities and stature.

Area residents interviewed by reporters spoke again and again about the tragedy of the incident Monday night in residence in New York City.

The most frequently used word was "waste" — the waste of a life of a 40-year-old man and the waste of a great talent. Those interviewed talked about the senselessness of someone killing a man who had contributed much to the world and who now asked for only peace from it.

They talked as if they had lost a friend, not heard about the death of an entertainer. The interviewees — mostly between 25 and 40, the Beatle generation — talked of Lennon's influence on everything from eyeglasses to non-violence.

Mark Pasman, 25, spliced bits of tape together Tuesday afternoon at WRIF-FM for a special program on Lennon's life and spoke of the significance of Lennon on his own life.

"WHEN THE Beatles came out in '63-'64 I was eight or nine," Pasman said. "I knew the minute I saw them on Ed Sullivan I'd be in this business. They just grabbed you."

"It was the intimacy, the way they affected people. Few entertainers, maybe Elvis, can generate that kind of response with people."

Pasman said legions of fans grew up on the Beatles and were greatly affected by them. The Beatle influence

showed in hair styles and clothing styles, in music and in the politics that became popular among the young.

Frank Caruso, 39, of Birmingham heard about Lennon being murdered while watching Monday Night Football. Caruso, owner of the "It's the Ritz" resale shop in Birmingham, said he felt a great emptiness.

Caruso, who left the record store empty handed, said he admired Lennon for the strength of his convictions as well as his songwriting ability.

"IT'S A personal thing," he said. "I respect him and what he stood for. I think the man had a deep appreciation of love for many things. In his involvement with his wife (Yoko Ono), that showed very clearly. I didn't think she was an extremely great talent but I respect her because of the way John felt."

"She probably influenced him more than any other person, or he wouldn't have went through so much with her."

He had the security of money but he needed someone," Caruso said.

Caruso believes Lennon's new album, "Double Fantasy," the first album he has released in six years, will be a classic.

By Tuesday afternoon Marty's Records in Birmingham had sold every copy of every Lennon album in stock and had only one cassette tape left.

The news of Lennon's murder spread quickly. Friends called each other on the telephone to relay the news late Monday night. Lunchtime talk overheard Tuesday afternoon was invariably about the sudden loss. Even older folks whose musical tastes are closer to Mantovani talked about what an awful thing had happened and what a wide impact Lennon's music had on the world.

TV NETWORKS eulogized the Beatles more than Lennon. Rock radio stations such as WRIF, WABX and

WWWW played special tributes during the day and a wake of sorts was held Tuesday night at the Roostertail Supper Club.

Lennon was arriving home Monday evening from a recording date with his wife when he was shot in front of his apartment building by a man who had earlier in the evening had Lennon sign an autograph.

Irony was abundant in the incident.

A man who was often ridiculed for espousing peace and love became a victim of violence.

A man who for the last seven years retreated from the public eye in a vain attempt to lead a normal life was shot perhaps only because he was famous.

Cost hikes tied to shifts in schools

nanced Hulsing, Field and Eriksson elementaries and Canton Phase III.

As that debt is paid off, the district each year is able to lower the debt retirement millage as the board only levies the amount needed each year to make the annual payment on the construction loan.

The board's hope is that the millage needed for a new bond issue will equal the scheduled decreases in the existing levy so that the proposal won't result in a millage increase.

At most, the new bond proposal could result in a debt levy of 0.2 mills, or 20 cents per \$1,000 SEV, which would increase property taxes by \$7 for the owner of a \$70,000 home.

MOST OF THE costs to be covered by the bond issue are associated with changes to occur in the 1981-82 school year explains Rav Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business and finance.

First will be the equipping and operating of Lowell Junior High, being rented from Livonia Schools next year which will cost about half a million dollars.

Another major move will be to expand Extended School Year (ESY) to four more elementaries which carries a price tag of up to \$1 million.

The school board next year also plans to re-align the grades with the ninth grade moving from the high school to the middle school level and the sixth grade back to the elementary

level. This shift is expected to cost about \$335,000.

Depending upon the final plan selected, says Hoedel, the total costs of next year's changes will be from \$1.1 million to almost \$1.7 million. Of this amount, some \$807,500 could be financed with a future bond issue.

Among the expenses to be covered in a bond issue are: air-conditioning to add four elementaries to ESY, \$600,000; equipment needs, \$300,000;

media equipment for Lowell, \$100,000, and a new roof for Central Middle School, \$500,000.

Even with a \$2.5 million bond issue, Hoedel says, there is a strong possibility the district's present debt levy of 3.12 mills would remain the same or even decrease if the bond issue passes.

This would depend, he adds, on the six of the taxbase each year and on the rate of interest existing when the bonds are sold in the market.

Joyner abstains as county board appoints Scott

Another ex-Wayne County Commissioner has been appointed to a county job by former fellow commissioners.

Martha G. Scott, of Highland Park was appointed by the full county board of commissioners last week to the job of civil service commissioner, within hours of her resignation as county commissioner.

Scott would have been out of a county job Dec. 31 when her term as county commissioner expires. Instead of running for re-election last summer to the job of county commissioner, she ran for the office of state representative. Scott was defeated in the August primary by incumbent Rep. Ethel Terrell.

The job of county commissioner, which is not considered a full-time job, pays some \$20,000 a year.

The part-time civil service post, which pays \$14,520 a year, was vacated by Joan Pettipren of Westland in early October. Mrs. Pettipren resigned to accept a controversial appointment as assistant director of personnel services for the Wayne County Road Commission, a job which pays \$41,300.

The county board suspended its rules to conduct the election last Thursday and the necessary 18 commissioners voted in favor of the appointment. Four commissioners abstained, in effect voting against the appointment. Four other commissioners, including Mary Dumas, R-Livonia, were absent.

County Commissioner R. William Joyner, D-Plymouth, who abstained, said the action was another case of the county "protecting its own."

COUNTY BOARD appointments of one-time commissioners to vacant county jobs have become common.

In recent years, nearly a dozen former county board members have been appointed to various county boards, agencies or commissions.

They include John Barr, personnel director of the civil service commission, a former county board chairman; Robert E. FitzPatrick, director of the Wayne County Economic Development Corporation, also a former board chairman; Royce Smith, managing director of the county Department of Public Works; Mel Ravitz, director of the Detroit-Wayne County Community Mental Health Board; Roscoe Bobo, the county's Lansing lobbyist; and Thomas O'Rourke, managing director of the road commission.

Among the commissioners who voted for Scott's appointment were western Wayne commissioners Richard Manning, D-Redford Township; Kay L. Beard, D-Inkster/Westland; Thomas Presnell, D-Garden City/Westland and Elaine Gregory, D-DeARBorn.

SCOTT had been on the county board since February 1978 serving a district which includes Hamtramck, Highland Park and part of Detroit. She was chairwoman of the board's human resources committee and a strong supporter of the now-defunct county Office on Aging.

The civil service commission acts as the county's personnel office. Among its duties are to approve new job classifications and approve the criteria for job promotions.

Lesson in political maneuvers

Old-fashioned political back-scratching caused two western Wayne County state representatives to switch their votes and support the controversial \$800,000 state subsidy to the Pontiac Silverdome last week.

Under pressure from Oakland County legislators and Silverdome lobbyists, Livonia Republicans Jack Kirksey and Sylvia Skrel voted to continue the state's annual contribution to the 5-year-old stadium's debt retirement.

In return, they got assurances of continued state grants of \$400,000 to the city of Livonia and \$775,000 to the city of Northville for policing traffic generated by the Detroit Race Course and Northville Downs, respectively.

Even though House opponents of the Silverdome subsidy prevailed (56-31), the grant is expected to be reinstated by the Senate this week. The entire bill will then go to a joint legislative conference committee.

BOTH LEGISLATORS initially voted with the House of Representatives majority (62-30) Wednesday to remove the Silverdome subsidy from the

annual grants and transfers bill.

Then, according to Kirksey, the phone started ringing. He said he was called by "three or four senators and a couple of lobbyists."

The calls, said Kirksey, were "of a nature that said, 'If you vote to take the (Silverdome) money out, we're going to do everything we can in the Senate to take your race track money.'"

When the Silverdome vote came up again on reconsideration Wednesday, Skrel and Kirksey voted against cutting the money out of the bill. The city of Pontiac uses the \$800,000 to pay off bonds.

SKREL WOULDN'T say she was pressured to change her vote, but added, "that implication (of Livonia's money for the race track being in jeopardy) was there."

"There are certain side shows always going on," she said.

"If I had no race track (in the district), I probably would have thought differently (about the Silverdome issue). We did make that agreement long before I was here."

The Silverdome subsidy and state aid to cities with race tracks comes from

the same pot — state taxes on race track betting. Besides Livonia and Northville, the current bill has \$800,000 for Hazel Park, \$162,000 for Jackson and \$127,000 for Saginaw.

Kirksey said the annual grant to Livonia is "not a subsidy, but reimbursement for expenses," primarily police security and traffic control when DRC is open.

"I RESENTED having to vote that way, but I felt obligated to do so," said Kirksey. "It would have been a disaster to Livonia and Northville if those funds had been in jeopardy."

Kirksey's district is the only one in Michigan with two race tracks.

Tom Griffith, a city accountant, said the state money goes in Livonia's general fund. "A piece of it goes to every activity within that general fund," he

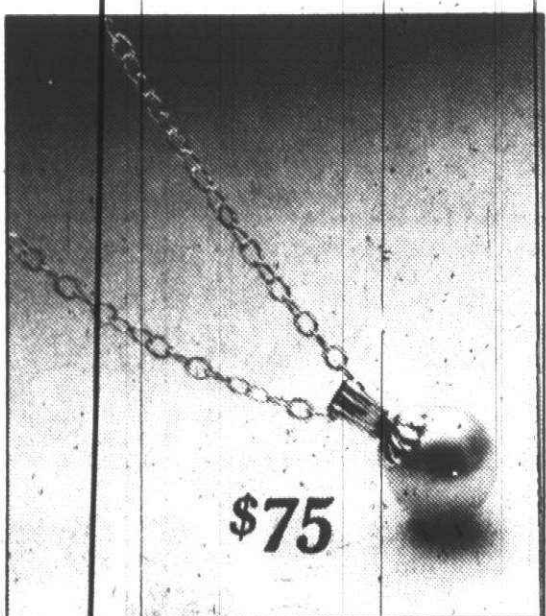
said.

Livonia Police Chief Robert Turner said the city has "22 to 30" officers assigned to DRC daily when it's open, including "four to seven" plain-clothes officers inside.

"They would have a lot of thefts if we weren't there," Turner said. He estimated that cost of police service alone approaches \$300,000 annually, including time spent by officers processing arrests and appearing in court.

"When it's empty, we still keep patrolling it," he added. Turner said the track is usually open eight months a year.

Other western Wayne legislators supported removal of the Silverdome subsidy. They include state Reps. John Bennett, D-Redford, Thomas Brown, D-Westland, William Keith, D-Garden City, and Roy Smith, R-Saline.

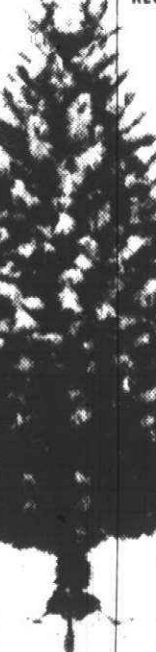

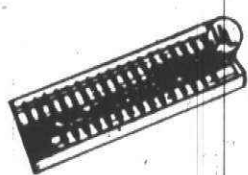

Balloonacy hits Plymouth

Continued inflation is an uplifting idea for the owners of Gourmet Balloons.

Gourmet Balloons is a relatively new firm engaged in raising people's spirits with helium-filled bouquets.

Although in business only since late summer, the three business partners who pioneered the concept are already convinced the venture will be a success.

The main principals are Janice Cherkasky of West Bloomfield, Marcia Kreger of Plymouth and Adrienne Klemme of Farmington Hills.

Just like floral bouquets, balloon bouquets are delivered for birthday wishes, wedding surprises and get-well gestures.

Flowers, candy or a message is placed in a basket which is tied to colored balloons. The idea started as a fad on the East Coast, spread to southern

California where it became a serious business, and now is making its appearance in this area.

The response thus far for Gourmet Balloons has been overwhelming, said Ms. Cherkasky, whose West Bloomfield home serves as business headquarters.

"Ever since our first ad appeared in the area papers we have been swamped with orders for almost every imaginable occasion," she said.

Ms. Kreger doubles as the company's financial planner and as the business calligrapher "for those really special events."

"Everything really took off on Sweetest Day," said Ms. Kreger. That day more than 20 minibouquets (a satin-ribboned assortment of nine balloons) and grand bouquets (15 balloons) were delivered to area residents.

For an additional charge the firm attaches special baskets whose contents

are personally selected by the buyer.

"We have delivered imported chocolates for lovers, cookies for children, jewelry for anniversaries, you name it," she said. "I suppose one of our most unusual deliveries was a can of chicken soup for get-well encouragement of a sick friend. But our favorite may be the bouquet sent to celebrate a new face-lift."

Since their Sweetest Day success, the three partners have ballooned anniversary and birthday parties, a wedding, Halloween balls, political rallies, a fashion show at Cobo Hall, and election get-togethers.

The coup-de-grace of the business has been the "Balloonacy." In this "minihappening" Ms. Cherkasky and Ms. Klemme arrive dressed as Tweedledum and Tweedledee with full theatrical make-up and present the honoree with a dozen helium-filled colored balloons.

2 arrested for break-ins

Two Garden City men were arrested last weekend in connection with a Nov. 22 break-in at a Plymouth Township home while allegedly leaving the scene of a Dearborn Heights home break-in, said Det. Richard Fenton of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department.

The men face a Dec. 15 exam on the Plymouth Township charge before Judge James Garber of the 35th District Court, Canton.

The charge of breaking and entering carries a maximum 15-year prison sentence.

Small bus strike enters 3rd month

A wage dispute that has shut down two of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority's (SEMTA) small bus operations has entered its third month.

A settlement is far away, say spokesmen for both sides — Teamsters Local 247, which represents an estimated 100 drivers and clerks, and Transit Management Inc., which operates the Oakland County and Wayne County Advanced Reservation Transit Systems under a service contract with SEMTA.

"We've gone backwards," Teamsters negotiator David Schuler said last week.

"We're still a long distance apart on wages," said Ronald Barnes, general manager of Transit Management of Wayne and Oakland County.

THE STRIKE has halted service since Oct. 3 for an estimated 1,200 daily users of the OCART and WAYCART systems. Users are primarily elderly and handicapped.

Neither Transit Management nor SEMTA has attempted to provide an alternative service, spokesmen said.

"We don't really have any way to provide an alternative other than the (large bus) line system," said Michael Dewey, manager of SEMTA's small bus systems.

SEMTA has not participated in negotiations. "We really can't do anything," Dewey said. "It's a dispute between the contractor and the labor union."

"We do not see any particularly strong or clear indication that there are some grounds on which to resolve this thing."

Dewey said SEMTA receives "complaints and expressions of concern on a daily basis" regarding the strike.

BARNES SAID "a little, not very much" progress had been made in negotiations since the strike began. Besides wages, a major issue is use of part-time employees.

Schuler said Transit Management wants to "hire as many part-time people as they want" and not guarantee the full-time employees a 40-hour week. Part-time employees have not been used before.

The Teamsters have represented the drivers and clerks since late July. Transit Management took over operating the service on July 1.

Neither side would give details on wage negotiations. Prior to the strike, drivers were paid \$4.05 per hour, but were guaranteed a 47-hour week. With overtime, the actual hourly wage was \$5.11.

Schuler said the drivers of small buses are not seeking parity with those of large buses. "Hell, that's a 100 percent increase," he said. "I know I ain't going to get that."

A BARGAINING session, with mediators from the state and federal governments, was held Tuesday.

The strike has not affected SEMTA's Dial-A-Ride small bus service in various cities, including Birmingham and Redford Township.

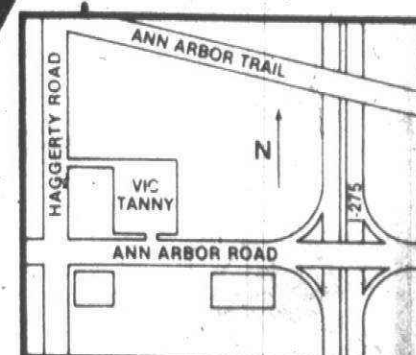

Overweight? Is it muscle or fat?

Question: Can I rely strictly on the height/weight tables to determine if I'm overfat? What are the most accurate methods for someone to determine his percentage of body fat? What are normal values for percent body fat for men and women?

T.S., Livonia

The Limitations of standard height eight tables were first illustrated in the early 1940s when Dr. Albert Behnke, a navy medical doctor, made a detailed study of the body fatness of professional football players.

When the players' weights were compared with those recommended from insurance tables, most were designated as markedly overweight. However, a more careful evaluation of body composition revealed that almost all the players were quite lean and had only a small percentage of body fatness.

These data were among the first to illustrate that overweight due to a preponderance of bone and muscle does not have the same significance as overweight due to excessive fatty tissue. Hence, the standard scale weight may not truly reflect the degree of body fatness.

THE MOST ACCURATE method yet devised for estimating body fatness is the underwater weighing technique.

The method involves a comparison of the person's weight in air to that with the person submerged under water. The procedure is based on the principle that fat people float easier than their leaner counterparts, since fat tissue is less dense (weighs less) than water and other body tissues.

A more practical method to estimate body fatness, frequently employed by physiologists and nutritionists, involves the use of skinfold caliper. Since about one-half of the total body fat is located directly under the skin, it is possible to estimate fat weight or the percentage of body fat simply from skin fold thickness measurements.

The technique takes only a few seconds to complete, with measurements taken at various sites, e.g., the back, abdomen and back of the upper arm.

Both the underwater weighing and skinfold methods require trained personnel, expensive equipment, and mathematical computations. These evaluations are often available through university fitness centers, hospitals, and recreational facilities (e.g., health clubs, YMCA, JCC) at a reasonable fee.

MEN SHOULD have a percent body fat of 15 to 18 percent, and women between 19 and 23 percent.

If a man exceeds 25 percent and a woman exceeds 30 percent, they are considered obese (overfat).

Incidentally, the lean appearance of the marathon runner has been confirmed by body composition measurements. The top male marathoners in the world have only 3 to 7 percent body fatness.





Open meetings charge dropped

The Plymouth Township Board of Trustees will not be defending itself in court this week on charges that it violated the Open Meetings Act.

Carol and Jim Levitte, township residents who filed those charges against six board members and township attorneys in Wayne County Circuit Court in November, withdrew their complaint last week.

By Tuesday, both sides consented to end the legal action. Wayne County Circuit Judge Robert Colombo signed the order to dismiss the action Wednesday,

two days before a previously scheduled hearing date.

Mrs. Levitte, an unsuccessful candidate for township supervisor in the November election, said she decided against pursuing the case on advice from her new boss, attorney Robert Delaney of Plymouth.

She said she felt "weary" and felt the opposition had leveled personal attacks rather than legal ones.

"I felt there would be no benefit derived from that," she said. "I filed the lawsuit based on principle and I'm

withdrawing it based on principle.

"I would rather put my efforts into doing something more constructive."

Delaney, meanwhile, said he advised Mrs. Levitte to pull out of the legal action because he did not believe her charges would hold up in court.

Mrs. Levitte, an attorney, recently began working for Delaney as a researcher.

"After looking at the circumstances, I didn't think she had a valid cause of action," Delaney said. "The complaint didn't meet the requirements of the

statute it was coming under."

"I felt there was no intent on the board's part to violate it," he added. "It's a highly technical and difficult act for a governmental body to comply with. There's a tight walk between what you can do and can't do."

Under the final close-out action, the charges that alleged violations of the Open Meetings Act in six meetings cannot be reintroduced in court.

The township board last Tuesday voted unanimously to accept the offer to dismiss the case.

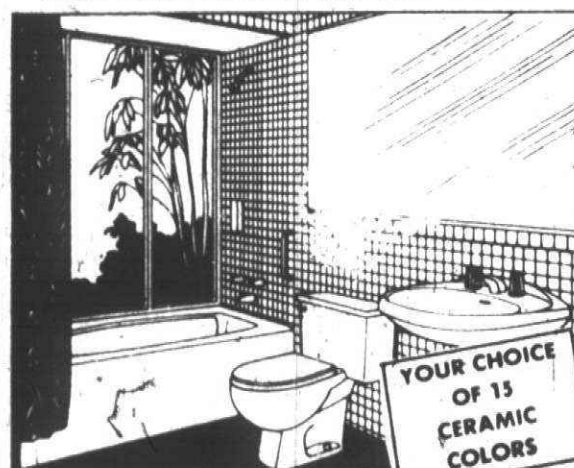

How nun sees a big university

Her positions in education for 32 years represent a wealth of experience. You name it, she's been it — elementary and secondary private school teacher, professor and administrator in private and public colleges.

But Dr. Suzanne Fleming brings a uniqueness to Eastern Michigan University. She's a member of the Order of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Having a member of a religious congregation in a public university position still is a rarity. But Dr. Fleming points out that, although her order has experienced dramatic external changes, "the big change is in accepting us into public institutions."

"I BRING MY religious congregation as a background like a married woman or single woman bring their backgrounds. Institutions now see us as candidates for jobs like everyone else," she said.

Dr. Fleming says that her progression from an elementary school teacher in private Catholic schools in Detroit beginning in 1948 to her current position as assistant vice president of academic affairs at EMU has been a natural one.

Fleming feels there are positions available, and that a pool of qualified women exists for higher positions.

Some women, however, create their own drawbacks, she added, explaining that "women in small institutions feel often that they can only move into another position with a small institution."

Not so with Dr. Fleming. She has always been interested in a position, either teaching or administering, in a large college.

She began teaching chemistry at Marygrove in 1962. She was a visiting

lecturer in chemistry at the University of Michigan from 1968-69. From 1969-1975, she again taught chemistry at Marygrove and served as chairperson of the natural science division for five of those years.

In 1975, she became a "reluctant administrator" at Marygrove.

Marygrove faculty voted on three possible choices to fill a vacant vice president and dean position. From those candidates, the Marygrove president chose her for the job.

CHOOSING CHALLENGE administrators has changed lately, Fleming said. "The traditional presumption that if you're a good faculty member, and if you're a good department head, then you'll be a good administrator just isn't always so. As we move into the 1980s, management and analytical skills have

become more important," Fleming stated.

"Employees need a feeling of worth. It's important to make employees feel good about what they're doing. They need to know that they're making a contribution to the institution."

"IN HIGHER education administration, whether a college is small or large, private or public, the issues tend to be the same," Dr. Fleming said, citing basic studies curricula and integration of cooperative education as examples.

In addition, Marygrove has been traditionally a teacher education institution as has EMU.

Dr. Fleming, who joined the EMU administration in July, has many responsibilities.

She is a "catalyst for program development" and cited her work with the College of Technology and the College of Human Services. She is serving as an information source for the Basic Studies College Standing Committee, created as a successor to the Basic Studies Committee.

In addition, Fleming is exploring the coordination of evening and summer course offerings with an eye to giving students a chance to earn a degree by taking these offerings.

She also is a liaison for cooperative education, serving as a link to central administration for that area. Fleming chairs the search committee for the head of industrial technology as well.

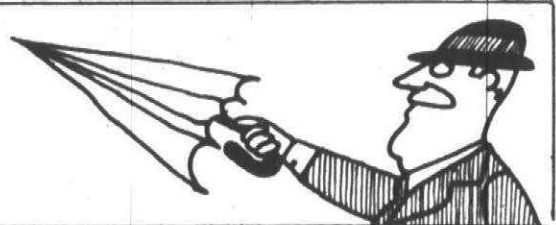

In a directory compiled by the Office of Admissions, employment outlook in the applied science programs are rated as excellent, very good, good or fair. Salaries and wages are based on October 1980 entry level positions.

BUSINESS CAREERS

● **ACCOUNTING** — Very good. \$750-1,300 per month.

Accountants compile, analyze and prepare business and financial records such as profit and loss statements, balance sheets, cost studies and tax reports. They may specialize in areas as auditing, tax work, cost accounting, budgeting and control or systems procedures.

● **CLERK-TYPIST** — Good. \$500-750 per month.

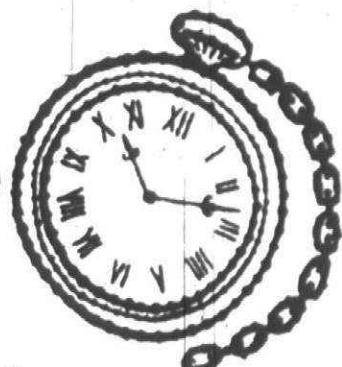

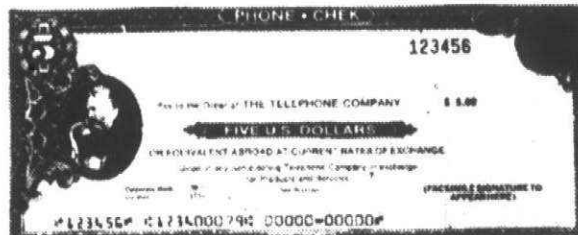

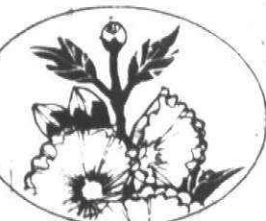

The medical technologist helps identify the causes and cures of diseases by performing laboratory tests. The tests may include chemical testing of body tissues and fluids, identification of bacteria and parasites, and blood cell counting and blood typing.

• **REGISTERED** — Excellent. \$7.31-\$9.05 per hour. Civil Service, \$18,613 per year.

This nurse plans, gives, and supervises nursing care, teaches health care personnel, and assists in teaching health care functions to patients and their families. Employment is available in hospitals and community health services outside the hospital or institution or institutional setting.

• **MEDICAL RECORD TECHNOLOGY** — Very good. \$5.75-6.25 per hour.

Tailpipe emissions tests to be enforced in '82

By January of 1982, your car will need to pass a tailpipe emissions test before you can purchase new license plates.

The test cost is limited to \$10, and there will be special provisions if the cost of repairs is more than \$50.

Those are the basic outlines of the 1980 Vehicle Inspection and Maintenance Act (I/M) passed by the Michigan Legislature and implemented by the departments of Natural Resources and State.

But there are all sorts of fine details, as the public learned last week.

Rodger James and staff members of the Michigan Department of State conducted a seminar in Southfield for garage operators, fleet owners and the general public.

Here are their answers to basic questions from drivers:

Q. What vehicles must be tested and, if necessary, repaired each year?

A. Vehicles built in 1971 or earlier are exempt.

There are three sets of emissions standards, according to the model

year of your car: 1972-74, the easiest to pass; 1975-80; and 1981 and newer, the most stringent.

Cars less than 12 months old are exempt.

Vehicles with gross weights of more than 8,500 pounds are exempt. Diesel vehicles are exempt.

Also exempt are mopeds, motorcycles and electrical vehicles.

The law applies to vehicles owned by persons living in Wayne, Oakland, Macomb and Washtenaw counties, where air pollution problems are worst.

Q. I'm out of a job and can't really spare money for either an emissions test or repairs. What can I do?

A. Persons on Medicaid and general assistance (welfare) have had their vehicles exempted. You need to show some proof of such a status when purchasing your new license plates.

Q. Couldn't someone beat the system by registering his car in the name of his grandmother on Medicaid, or by using a friend's address outside Wayne, Oakland, Macomb or Washtenaw counties?

A. Maybe for awhile. The number of persons on Medicaid is known; if there are more vehicles exempted for this reason than there are persons on Medicaid, the state can do some checking and crack down.

As for using a false address, you'd make more problems for yourself than the savings would be worth. Your vehicle registration wouldn't match your driver's license address, voter registration and printed bank checks.

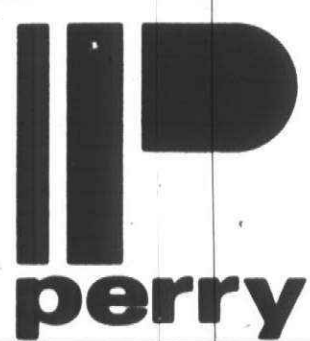
Q. Why are diesels and big trucks exempt?

A. They emit different kinds of pollutants. Diesels are a small part of the fleet. If their emissions become a problem, they could be brought under the act later.

As for large trucks, they were designed to "run dirty," and there's little you can do to clean them up. Autos, however, have been the subject of federal emissions standards for years.

Q. Is this test fee tax deductible?
A. Not yet. But there is a plan in the Legislature to amend the tax code to provide a credit against your income tax for the test fee.

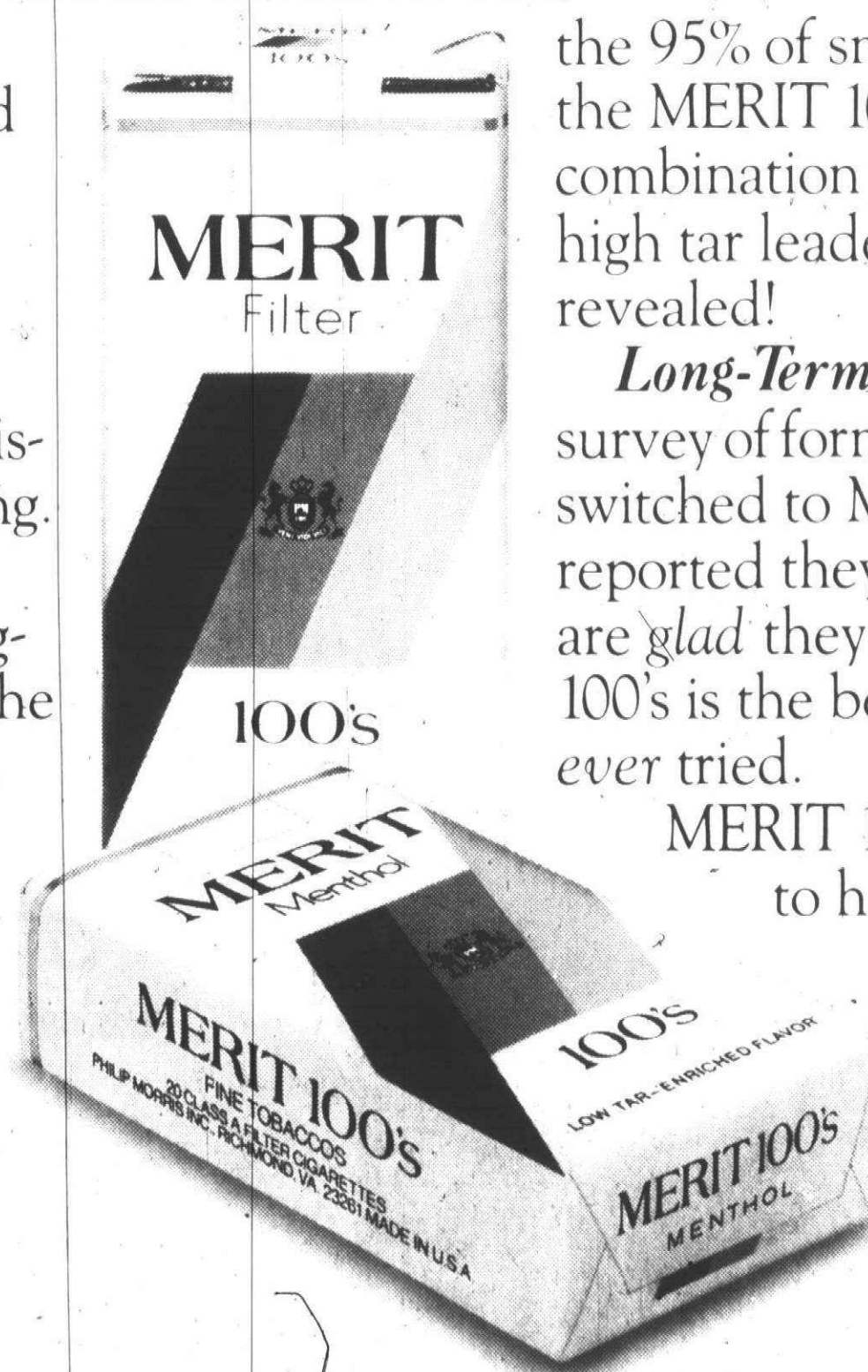

New law may reduce auto insurance rates

If you're a male and suspect you pay too much for car insurance, a new insurance law may reduce your rates.

Your female counterpart, however, may find her insurance rates going up after Jan. 1.

If your home insurance rates are higher because you live in a certain area, and/or you believe all companies charge the same rates for home and auto insurance, the new insurance law will help you discard those fears.

The Michigan Essential Insurance Act, going into effect after the first of the year, will make car and home insurance available to nearly everyone in the state. In addition, it will restrict charging higher insurance rates to people on the basis of factors over which they have no control such as gender or home location.

The law requires insurance companies to inform their customers at least once a year which factors are used in

setting insurance rates, and customers can ask the company for information used to calculate their insurance bill. The insurer will also inform clients of the methods to protest rate determination. If you have been refused insurance, or think you have been charged too much, you will be entitled to an oral explanation and, upon request, a written reason.

Proponents of the new law say the key to competitive rates among insurance companies will depend on the consumer.

"WE STRONGLY encourage people to shop around for the best price on car and home insurance," said Barbara Edwards, a State Insurance Commission analyst.

"Comparison shopping in the insurance marketplace will serve to keep rates lower for the consumer," she added.

Car insurance rates will not be based on sex or marital status, although age

will continue to be a factor in determining individual rates. Individual driving records will become more important, as will the type of car driven, income of the driver, number of miles driven and other criteria.

Young, female drivers with good driving records might expect a raise in their rates to offset the decline in rates to young male drivers with good driving records because age, but not gender, will continue to be used to set rates.

Home insurance rates may go up in suburban communities to offset a decline in rates for urban areas, Ms. Edwards said.

DRIVERS WHO want to buy car insurance will have to meet certain eligibility requirements according to the new law. Grounds for refusal of car insurance still include a suspended or revoked license; conviction within the past five years of insurance fraud or in the past three years of a felony resulting from operating a motor vehicle,

driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, leaving the scene of an accident which resulted in the death of someone; failure to meet vehicle safety requirements; failure to obtain membership in a club where membership is needed to buy insurance; or accumulation in the past three years of more than five points (if applying for insurance before Dec. 31, 1982) or six points (if applying on or after Jan. 1, 1983).

THE NEW law addresses eligibility requirements for home insurance as well.

The requirements are similar to car insurance eligibility, but ineligibility is expanded to include conviction of arson, malicious destruction, illegal or hazardous use of a dwelling, refusal to purchase reasonable amounts of insurance to protect, replace or repair the dwelling, non payment of property taxes for two years, and other related factors.

In determining whether or not a per-

son is eligible to purchase home insurance, however, the following factors cannot be considered: location, age or market value of the dwelling; amount of insurance being requested; or race, color, creed, marital status, sex, national origin, residence, age, handicap or lawful occupation of the applicant.

The criteria an insurer does decide to use will be filed with the commissioner of insurance for informational purposes only.

"There have been indications of heavy redlining in urban areas," said state Rep. Matthew MacNeely, chairman of the state House Insurance Commission. "This bill will eliminate that discrimination."

According to Terry Buckles, president of the Michigan Association of Insurance Companies (MAIC), the final version of the essential insurance law was not supported by either MAIC nor most segments of the insurance industry.

"ONE OF the problems is insurance companies are spending millions of dollars to conform to the act," he said. "As a result, many insured people will pay more."

MAIC contends that motorists in urban areas experience much higher losses than motorists who live in less congested areas, the most obvious reasons being traffic congestion, road conditions, terrain and police effectiveness.

Depending on a policyholder's driving record when making classification decisions may seem equitable at first, MAIC notes.

"But when carried to its logical extreme — where each policyholder is rated solely on his driving record — the result is self-insurance," an MAIC report said. "This defeats the whole purpose of insurance."

Although MAIC disagrees with the new law, Buckles said persons wishing to know more about essential insurance can call the MAIC hotline at 1-800-292-0712.

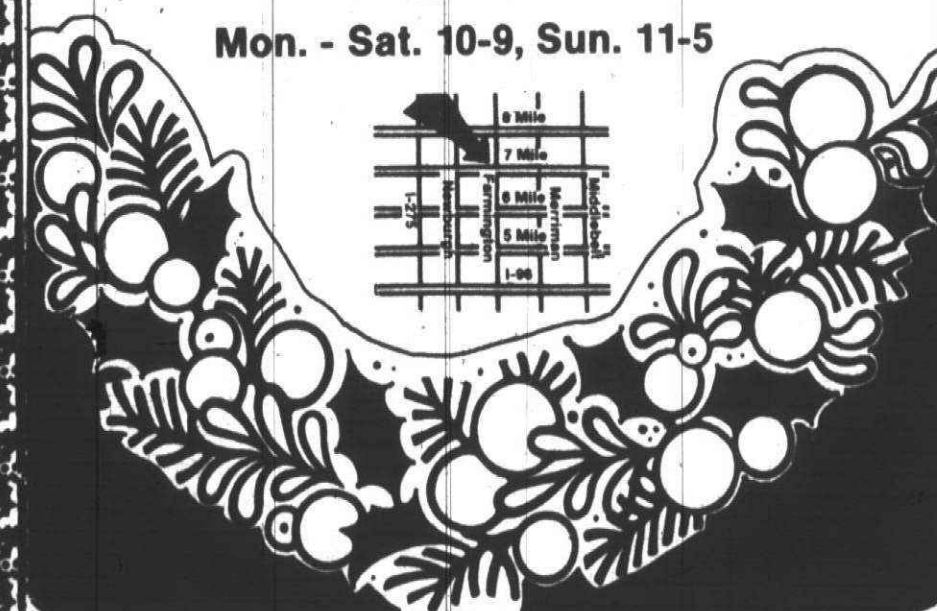

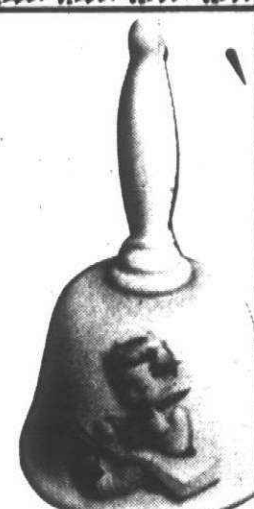

Poole's pay-cutting idea should be scrapped

In many respects, you have to credit Supervisor James Poole.

In August, he made a campaign pledge to slash his own salary if he were elected Canton Township supervisor.

Poole has held Canton's chief elected position for only three weeks. But he already has indicated plans to slash the supervisor's pay from \$32,500 to \$24,000 a year.

He says he will donate the money to the library or another good cause if the Township Board cannot — or will not — approve a pay decrease.

Poole's plan to keep his campaign promise is a move in his favor. Politicians too often forget promises made on the campaign trail or conveniently brush them aside when "more important" matters come up.

There's nothing wrong with donating part of his

pay as a charitable contribution. It would be a noble gesture on the part of Poole, who says he can afford to serve the people of Canton for less than \$32,500 a year.

BUT THERE'S a major problem with Poole's proposal for Township Board action on the pay issue.

A cut in the supervisor's pay by legislative decree wasn't a good idea when Poole campaigned for the supervisor's position. It isn't a good idea now.

Unlike most township officials, Poole collects a \$15,000 pension from the U.S. Air Force. Most persons who seek elective office do not enjoy that kind of financial cushion.

Cutting the supervisor's pay to \$24,000 a year could jeopardize Canton's chances for attracting qualified candidates in the future. Persons with

good paying jobs in the private sector would hesitate to run for the top administrative post, with its political difficulties and its fishbowl atmosphere.

It could ensure Poole long tenure in the supervisor's office by curtailing competition for the job.

It could place other township administrators, who rank below Poole, in an uncomfortable position. Clerk John Flodin, Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz and most department heads would earn more than the elected supervisor.

Those are the types of concerns the Township Board members had in mind when they set the supervisor's salary at its current level.

Those were probably among the concerns of the Michigan Legislature when it passed a law prohibiting slicing an elected official's pay.

POOLE IS HOPING to find a loophole in that law

by asking opinions from the Michigan Township Association and the Michigan attorney general's office on the Township Board's ability to slice his pay.

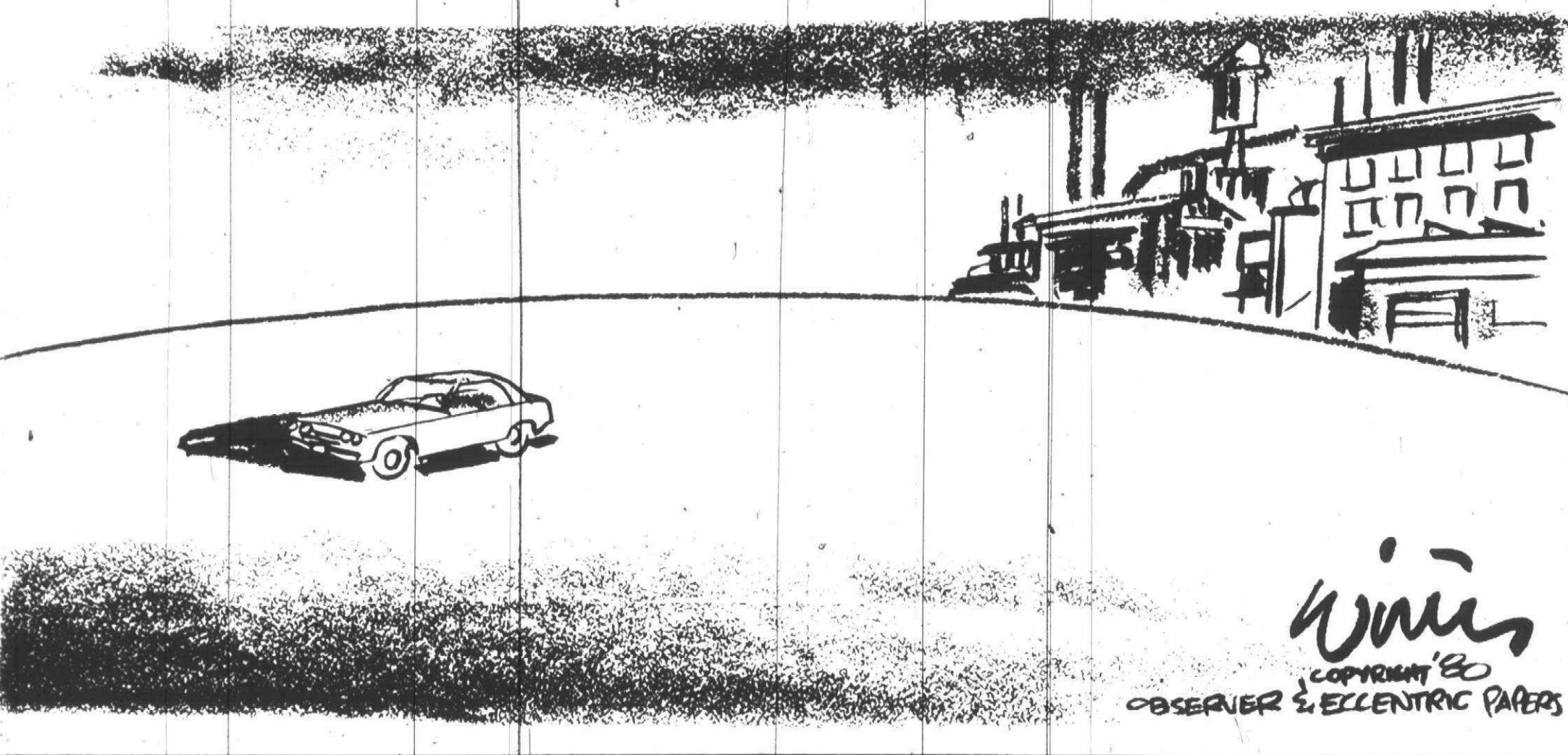
But the board should refrain from granting Poole's request — even if a legislative pay slice is deemed legal.

Poole would better serve the long-range interests of Canton Township by donating part of his salary to various organizations. The supervisor would be responsible for income tax payments on his entire salary. But he could deduct his tax obligation on the amount in question while making out the check.

That route would satisfy Poole's desire to serve for a lesser amount of money.

Unlike his proposal for legislative action, a donation plan would not jeopardize the quality of future government in Canton and might improve public services.

Young folks won't live like parents

In the suburbs, we've got ours. The nice question is whether the next generation will be able — or want — to keep it up.

Consider what life has been like in the metropolitan area outside the city of Detroit.

The standard has been the single-family detached dwelling, known colloquially as a home, occupied by a so-called owner who had no trouble getting a big mortgage loan from the savings and loan. The amount of rural land eaten up for housing expansion has grown far faster than the population.

The economic base was manufacturing jobs — autos, vans, trucks, steel products. There has been a high-wage policy because productivity could be increased in manufacturing through technology.

THE BUBBLE seems to have burst about 1973. Not only did that mark the beginning of the Arab oil price squeeze, it also marked the end of U.S. involvement in the Vietnam War.

A statistical picture of what has happened in this region has been put together by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. SEMCOG's "Southeast Michigan: A Profile of the Region" is a prelude to the official news we will get when the 1980 census is released April 1.

Metropolitan Detroit, known nationally for its high proportion of home ownership, isn't maintaining that distinction. In the 1970-79 period, only a bit more than half of the new building permits were for single-family detached houses. The most popular phenomenon has been the emergence of the condominium — ownership of compact housing with shared walls.

During the 1970s, the number of mobile home sites doubled — from more than 18,000 to nearly 41,000.

In 1950, just a few years after the end of World War II, about 9 percent of southeast Michigan's land had been developed. By 1975, we had developed 18.4 percent, and today about 20 percent is developed. In other words, we have developed more land in the last generation than in the first 250 years after Cadillac landed.

MEANWHILE, an incredible economic squeeze has been developing. Keep in mind that in the decade of the 1970s our population in southeast Michigan hovered around 4.7 million.

The proportion of us working in manufacturing jobs has dropped from 51 percent in 1970 to 46 percent in 1977. That means fewer opportunities for the introduction of technology, less chance for economic growth.

Many folks have the impression that mom and dad are bringing more bucks home from work, but they're not "getting ahead" because the bucks aren't going as far. And they are absolutely correct.

Median family income has hovered just below the \$8,000 in real terms (as opposed to inflated dollars) during most of the 1970s. In short, we have a stagnant economy.

PUT TOGETHER the housing picture and the economic picture, and you come up with this scene:

We are not making economic progress the way we used to, but many of us are still trying to live as if nothing had changed.

Increasingly, however, the young people — not us older folks who bought brick three- and four-bedroom houses in the 1950s and '60s — are discovering they can't afford to live the way their mothers and dads lived.

Just ponder these incredible numbers from the Federal Home Loan Bank: Less than a generation ago, a family spent less than 20 percent of its income on housing; today it spends nearly 40 percent on housing — and that family income figure now includes two salaries instead of one.

The impression one gets from the SEMCOG report is that the suburban land-gobbling boom of the postwar era is winding down. The whole thing is coming to a skidding halt.

Auto crisis breaks down solidarity

Well, it didn't work.

I'm talking about all this "buy American" automobile ballyhoo. You remember the line: "If only we have the chance to produce our new fuel-efficient front-wheel-drive models to compete with the foreign jobs, all will be nirvana in the Motor City."

Some reincarnation.

Ford Motor still is struggling and Chrysler is back in Washington begging for more dough to hold out until who-knows-what happens.

IN TRUTH, the American auto industry is washed up as a predominant force in the world market. With the exception, perhaps, of General Motors, in another five or 10 years, there won't be any such thing as an American auto industry.

American Motors will be controlled by the French-owned Renault, Ford will downsize its auto operations and depend on some commodity other than cars to turn a profit, and Chrysler will be something that kids talk about in history class.

Pick your cliché. All are applicable — You can't squeeze blood out of a turnip; they killed the goose that laid the golden eggs; they went to the well one time too many.

The "big is better" campaign finally did in the American auto industry. For years, consumers were brainwashed with the philosophy through television, billboards, magazines and newspapers.

And for years they believed it. Big cars not only meant more luxury but bigger paychecks for the



American auto worker, from top to bottom.

THAT WORKED during the '50s, '60s and the early '70s when the industry was making record profits. Lots of money and gasoline were available to spread around to everyone.

But today the profits are gone, fuel prices have quadrupled, the market has dissipated and the American automobile work force — what's left of it — still is hauling in wages much higher than other manufacturing workers in this nation.

Unfortunately, the once highly touted UAW philosophy of solidarity is dead. While thousands of auto workers forlornly stand in the unemployment line, their brothers and sisters keep accepting the high wages and overtime benefits.

It's a sorry scene.

While the UAW still has some clout left, it should march to the bargaining table, agree to lower wages and fewer benefits, and demand that the price of the American automobile be brought down so the industry truly can compete with our foreign neighbors.

Sure, you can blame the interest rates and out-of-line gasoline prices. But such protestations will do nothing to save jobs.

Whether or not it is true, the American consumer has little faith in this country's auto industry to build an affordable, reliable small car.

They remember such gems as the Corvair, Falcon and Pinto. They also remember the old Volkswagen, which was cheap and seemed to last forever. Americans are slow to forget.

They also are reluctant to pay \$8,000 or \$9,000 for a small American car. A foreign car, yes, an American car, no.

BUT WITH A little financial inducement, like bringing down the price of those small American jobs \$2,000, the market would pick up. Consumers will have a chance to see that what we build is just as good as the Japanese and Germans.

But if they don't buy cars, which they aren't, the American auto industry never will have a chance to erase its negative image.

Competition and sacrifice are what it's all about. We've done it before. We can do it again. But I bet we won't.

'Buy American'? Well, you can try

Buy American!

It is not unusual these days as you drive along the highway to see this slogan on the bumpers of the automobiles.

The slogan, born with the invasion of foreign autos that are blamed for the dip in the country's economy and the rising ranks of the unemployed, can cause a great deal of frustration when a fellow tries to live up to it.

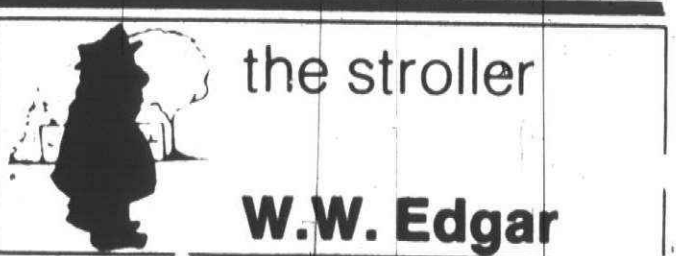
Buy American! Sure that sounds good, especially when the automobile manufacturers in our land are trying to compete with Honda, Toyota, Volkswagen and other imports.

BUT YOU are headed for a surprise when you attempt to "Buy American" when you leave the auto world to go shopping during the coming holiday period.

Just as an experiment, The Stroller went on an exploratory trip the other afternoon. Much to his surprise, he had trouble finding articles that bore the "Made In USA" stamp.

In fact, while trying not to be facetious, he spurned his morning coffee when the thought struck

him that the coffee beans had been grown in Brazil.

For a moment, he thought he had that licked when he reached for the tea bags. But he knows of no place in America where the tea leaves are grown. So he settled for a glass of milk.

That was just the starter.

ON HIS visit to the neighborhood mall, his eye was focused on a nice-looking pair of work shoes. They would be just the thing to wear when out helping to remove the snow this winter. And they would be just dandy for working in the garden.

At the store next door, to look over the latest styles in shirts and the type of material that was

A FEW WEEKS LATER came another query from O&E. Would the Irish newspaperman like to assume the role of O&E executive editor?

He accepted.

Three years ago this month, the newlyweds moved to O&E land. The job turned out to be a whirlwind project. It's no easy task keeping one step ahead of 12 young, talented community editors.

While all this was going on, MM decided she was tired of being "just a housewife." After all, you can capture the grandchildren (there were four then) only so many days a month and play golf with the girls only so many times a week.

She decided to go in business for herself. So Magnificent Marilyn was soon operating her own Insty-Prints shop in Garden City.

IN THE PAST 18 months, under MM's dedicated management, the business has grown to a point which is becoming too much for her.

The Irishman pondered. Maybe he should join forces with her. They could work side by side in her operation, just as they had with TARCO.

After 34 years in various newsrooms, maybe a new setting would be in order.

A final decision to move along was made last week. The Irishman found it difficult to bow out of the O&E, especially to leave his troupe of energetic editors and all those hard-working writers, photographers and copy editors.

Thus, like many love stories, this one has a marvelously happy ending. It has been fun.

Gossip, like junk food, is bad for America

Now that the American people have elected their highest officials, the media are rushing to provide us with delicious morsels about their private lives.

We are advised about President-elect Reagan's first marriage, Nancy Reagan's taste in fashion, the personal foibles of the Reagan children, and similar meaningful items pertaining to the vice president and other figures in the new administration.

The media are not alone to blame, because they respond to the American passion for gossip.

A GOSSIP is someone who indulges in idle, often malicious talk, especially about others.

The original meaning of gossip, according to the

dictionary, is one who stands sponsor at a baptism. From this, its meaning evolved towards someone who spreads confidential information that might be gained through any close relationship, or be intrusion into the privacy of others.

The differences between gossip and information should be noted.

First, gossip generally deals with the personal side of life. Second, it is not usually verifiable. Once uttered, it is widely accepted, regardless of its truth or falsity. Webster refers to it as "idle talk; groundless rumor."

Information about our political leaders is not an end in itself. It should enlighten us with regard to

public policy, controversial issues and critical decisions.

Such information is subject to the canons of verification and truthfulness. It is also limited to those aspects of the thought and conduct of our leaders relevant to their public responsibility and office.

WE NEED TO DRAW the line between relevant and irrelevant information.

If gossip served a useful purpose, then we should create legislation to monitor every move of our public figures. Television cameras could be installed in their offices, living rooms and bedrooms, and then we could all watch. Why rely on People

magazine when we could gaze upon live, daily telecasts?

Despite the apparent absurdity of this notion, we are fed such information obtained not by monitors, but by tasteless journalists who pander to the boundless public lust for gossip about prominent people.

In this land of plenty, we often feast foolishly. Junk food is part of our diet. But our weakness for delectable tidbits of what is nutritionally worthless is not limited to what we chew. It also includes what we choose to read and hear.

Gossip, like junk food, is not fatal but it is certainly injurious. The American public deserves a better menu.

Put another way, thanks to the continued wage demands of the UAW (and other unions), much of American business today is not competitive, both within this country, where in some regions less generous wage patterns prevail, and certainly outside the country where competition is becoming so fierce. Anyone familiar with the auto

industry certainly should recognize this situation.

What the UAW employees of Plymouth Stamping Co. should be doing is working hard at making their company competitive by being more productive and/or accepting less wages. Their very jobs are at stake!

Instead, what we have seen on Plymouth Road since Sept. 9 is the ridiculous spectacle of striking UAW members standing around the plant gates with their meaningless signs and placards.

I suppose this situation is fairly symbolic of union economics, i.e., not realizing that jobs are only possible with a healthy employer and overall sound economy.

Anyhow, cheers to the Plymouth Stamping Co. management and employees for trying to keep things running and thereby maintain the company's existence. Cheers to the UAW members huddled on Plymouth Road. Sorry they don't understand economic realities.

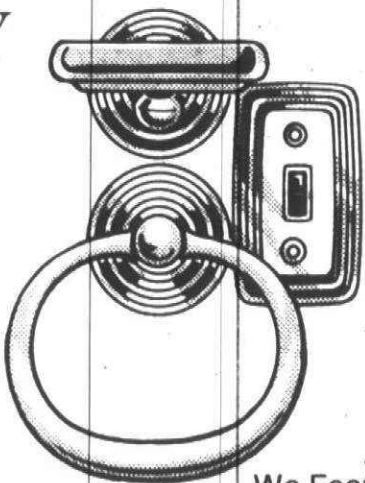
The Rev. Paul Hansen, associate pastor at People's Church, explained why the Carol Sing has been planned:

Main Street at Church. Admission will be \$1.50 for adults, 75 cents for children, or \$5.75 for a family with three or more children.

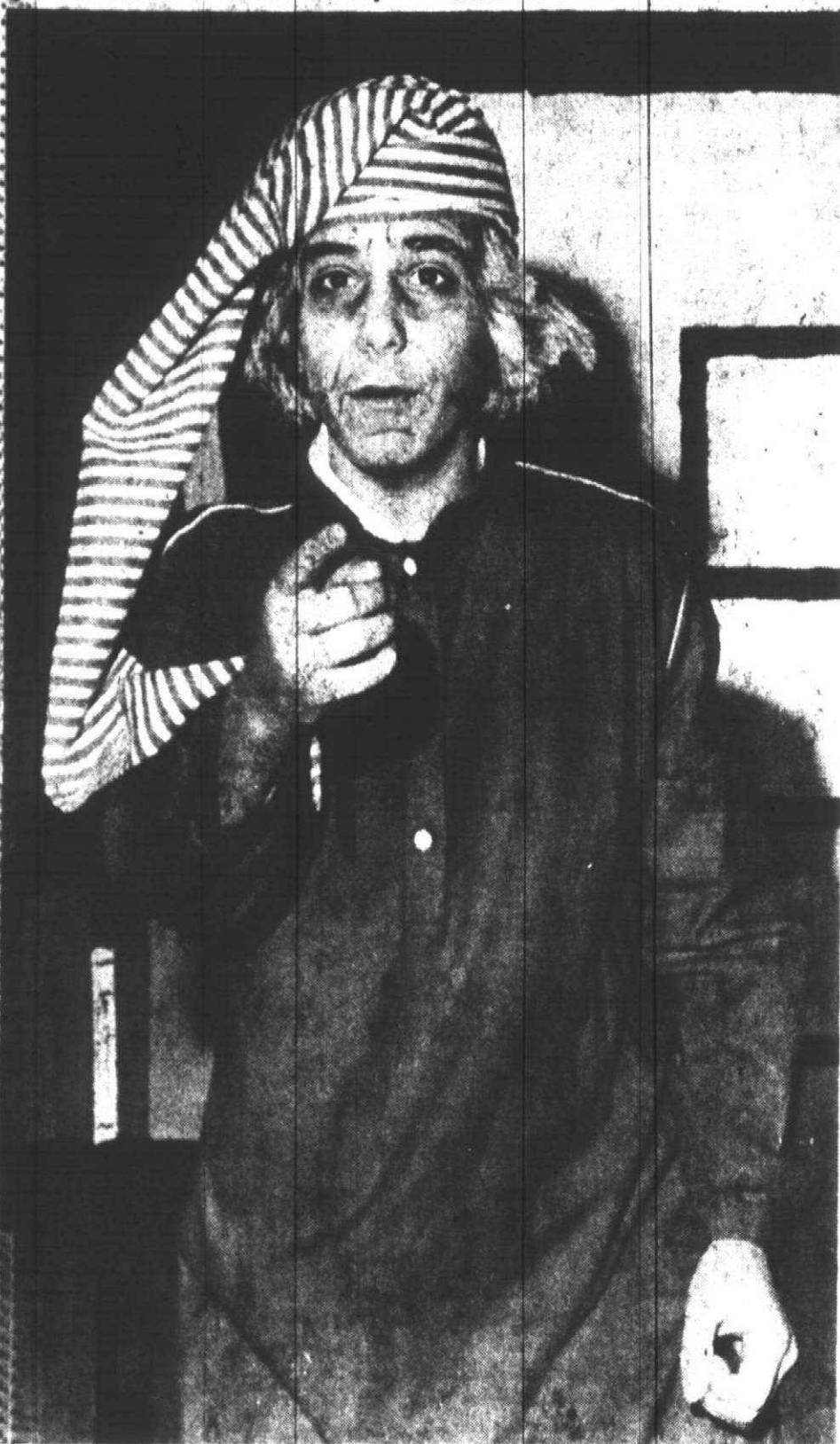

"We decided to try the joint performance last year," said Mrs. Erickson, "feeling it would give members a chance to meet some different people and the opportunity to have new worship experiences."

"Getting together has been a good experience. It is different to sing in a larger group, and members of both the choirs have enjoyed that. When last spring's performances were over, both groups said they would like to do it again."

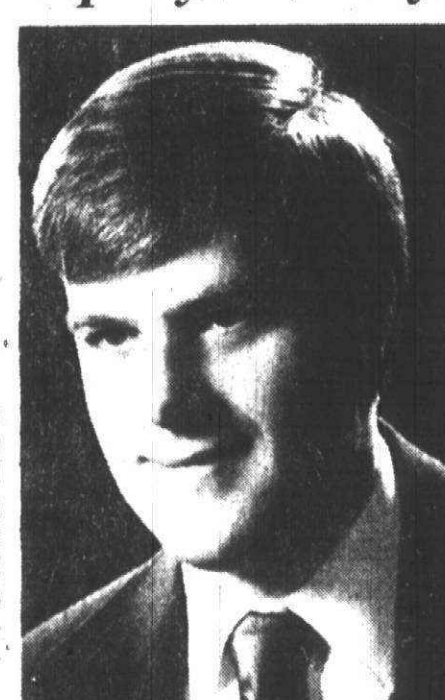

Keep poinsettias for another yule

Growing a poinsettia is one way of keeping the Christmas spirit alive through the entire year. Advice on caring for this traditional, ornamental plant is contained in the Cooperative Extension Service bulletin E-554, "Poinsettias."

Poinsettias are usually obtained during the holiday season and then nurtured through the year to flower again. Christmas care for a poinsettia includes placing it near a sunny window

or other well-lighted area being careful to avoid drafts.

Don't let any part of the plant touch cold window panes. The desired temperature is 60-70 degrees with temperatures of 55-60 degrees at night. Water when the soil is dry to the touch and apply enough to soak the soil to the bottom of the pot, discarding the excess water in the saucer.

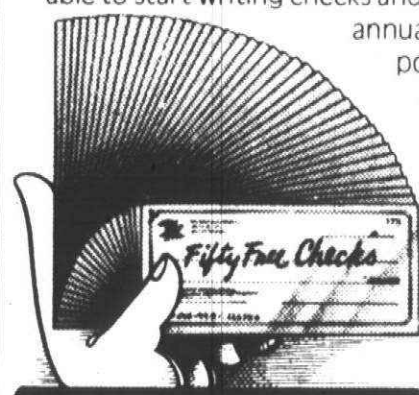

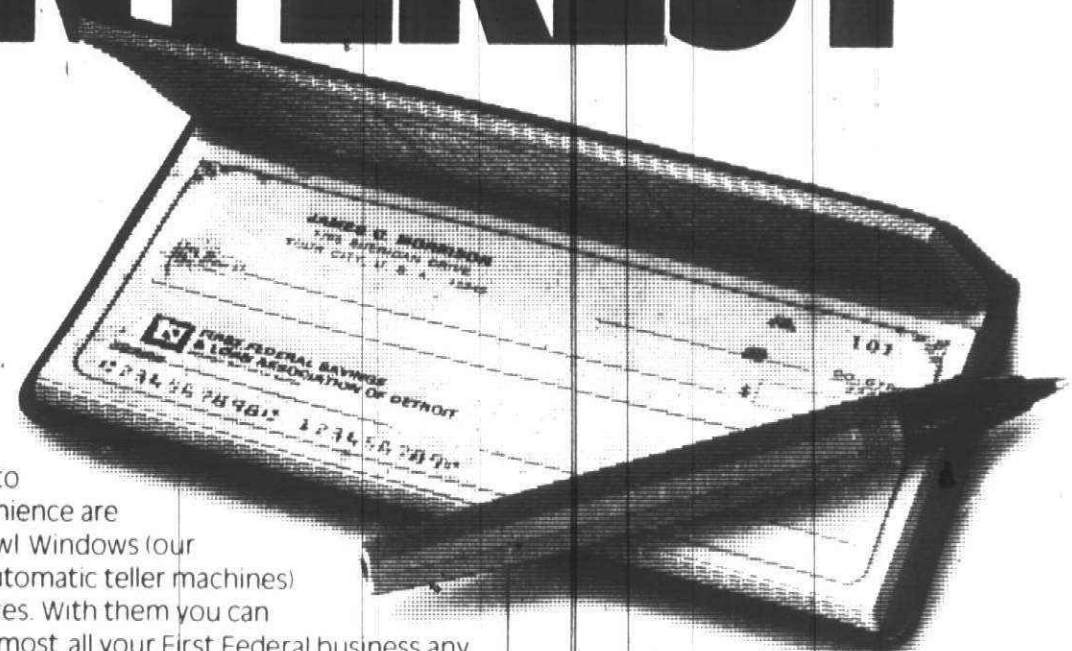

Salem girls win quarterfinal test

The thought of going to Lansing three months ago was only a dream for the Plymouth Salem girls' basketball team.

Not anymore.

The determined Rocks proved to be no fluke as they advanced to the Class A semifinals with a hard-fought 32-30 quarterfinal win last night over Suburban Eight League nemesis Trenton at Lincoln Park.

Salem posted a stunning comeback after trailing 11-0 at the outset of the first quarter.

It was patience and near-flawless ball handling which led to the victory.

Coach Bob Blohm's squad will meet No. 2 ranked and unbeaten Jackson in an 8:30 p.m. matchup Friday at Lansing Eastern.

"In a pressure situation this team catches and passes the ball better than any Plymouth Salem team I've coached," said Blohm, whose squad sports a 22-4 mark.

"As a coach I've never taken a team into the quarterfinals or semifinals," he said. "Anytime you advance this far — it's a great feeling."

During the regular season, Salem and Trenton split. This time it was the Trojans, led by 6-foot-3 center Kim Nash, which bolted out to a fast start.

Trenton's zone defense stymied the cold-shooting Rocks for much of the first half.

"We had a hard time getting inside," said Blohm. "It seemed Nash was blocking everything."

"When we jumped out to that quick lead, I was concerned with playing good defense," said Trenton coach John Biedenbach. "We were working the ball well offensively."

SALEM BEGAN to whittle away at the Trenton lead midway through the second quarter.

A short baseline jumper by Salem center Cheryl Sobkow with 34 seconds until intermission cut the margin to 15-12.

In the second half, Blohm changed his strategy a bit.

"We recognized that they (Trenton) weren't going to run up and down the

floor," said Blohm. "We took a gamble and tried to beat Kim Nash up the floor."

"Our emphasis at halftime was to start offensively off their turnovers and step up our guard pressure."

Salem's man-to-man defense began to wear down the Trojans in the third quarter.

Meanwhile, the Rocks started to get things going offensively behind the shooting of Jan MacKenzie, who tied Nash and Sue Mattice for game-high honors with eight points.

Salem's Carol Ross slipped inside on an out-of-bounds pass from teammate Jacque Merrifield and scored a layup to pull Salem even at 22-22. That basket came with 1:19 remaining in the third quarter.

In the final quarter, Salem began to control the tempo, as Eileen Moore and Ross directed the show.

Ross' free throw with 2:17 left put Salem ahead, 28-26. Nash then traveled 28 seconds later. Trenton later fouled Sobkow, who converted two free throws to stake the Rocks to a four-point lead.

Trenton retaliated with a basket, but Moore answered back with the game-winning shot at the 41-mark. She got a step on the Trenton defender and drove home for a layup.

Trenton, refusing to fold, narrowed the gap to two again, 32-30, with 19 seconds left on an inside conversion by Ann Marie Preston.

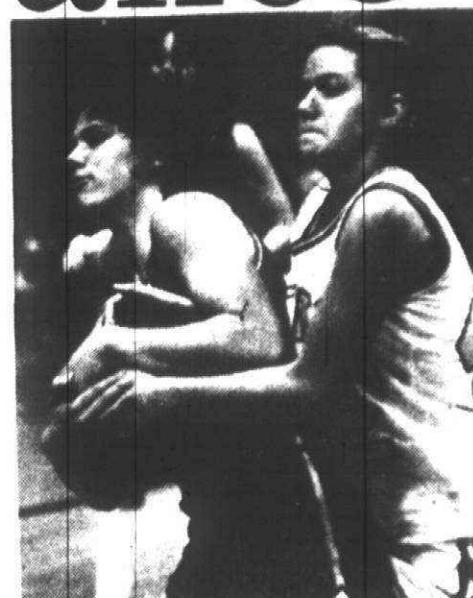
Biedenbach called a timeout immediately. Salem then inbounded the ball, killing 10 seconds off the clock.

MERRIFIELD WAS fouled with nine seconds to go. She missed the free throw as Trenton quickly grabbed the rebound and pushed the ball up the floor.

The Trojans missed two opportunities in the final seconds.

When the buzzer finally sounded, Salem fans poured onto the floor in a wild celebration.

"Our girls know what they need to do in a pressure situation," said the ecstatic Blohm. "We're not explosive, but we're very consistent. We've played a lot of

good teams and been in a lot of close games."

Despite the heartbreaking loss, Biedenbach was proud of his team's performance.

"No, I never thought we'd be here after going 5-and-15 last season," he said. "We had the momentum early and they began to pick it up. This game is a credit to our league. It's a tough league. I knew it would be a battle because they play good defense."

"But we still had a chance. We got off two shots there in the end."

Salem's scoring was balanced. Sobkow had seven points with Moore and Merrifield getting six each.

Nash had 10 rebounds and five blocked shots. Karen Soultz chipped in with seven.

Fans wanting to see the semifinal game between Salem and Jackson Friday night can reach Lansing Eastern High School by taking I-96 to I-496 (west) in Lansing. Then get off at the Pennsylvania Street exit in Lansing and turn right. The school is located approximately two miles from the exit.

inch and Paul Neschich.

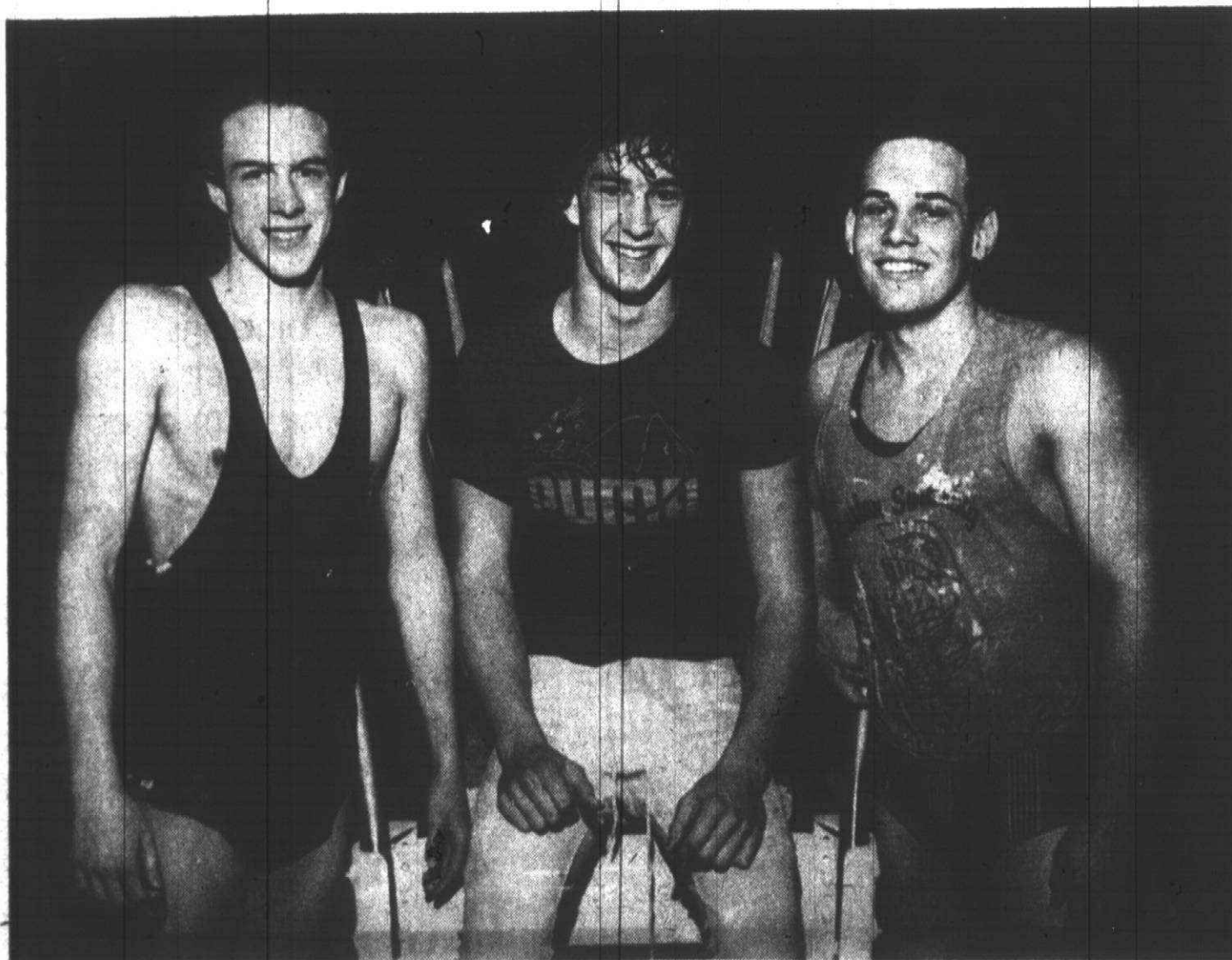
KLEINSMITH SWIMS both the butterfly and freestyle, McAninch swims the breaststroke, and Neschich swims the backstroke.

Rookie coach looks for development

Rookie coach Bill McCord can never accuse his Plymouth Canton boys' swim team of contracting "senioritis."

The Chiefs are young and inexperienced. They're also hungry to win, according to McCord, a 1972 graduate of old Plymouth High School.

"We don't have any seniors," said McCord, who took over for Bill Hahn. "It remains to be seen how the younger guys develop. We have a lot of potential and zero experience."

Hahn, who lasted only one year, left the boys' team in a precarious spot after resigning unexpectedly in September.

Most notably absent is Paul Petersen, a two-time state champ and nationally ranked swimmer. He's now

making waves for coach Doc Counsilman at Indiana.

McCord has picked four swimmers to share the captain's spot — junior Ron Hurley, Bob Simrak and Pete Stern. They are joined by sophomore John Simone.

ALL FOUR have considerable experience. They were letterwinners under Hahn.

Simone and Hurley will swim a variety of events. Simrak is basically a freestyle and backstroke performer, while Stern heads the sprint freestyle and butterfly crews.

The Chiefs are strong in the

breaststroke race with the return of junior Tom McKercher and sophomore Greg Schnurstein.

Junior Steve Gaggi returns in diving after a year of valuable experience.

Distance freestyle candidates include Glenn "Wheeler" Plagens, a sophomore, Pete Sicksels, a junior.

McCord said freshman Joe McBratnie, who will swim the individual medley and breaststroke, should contribute immediately.

"It remains to be seen how our younger guys develop."

Canton will open up its season tonight at Redford Union in a triangular meet with Livonia Clarenceville.

The Chiefs will compete in the prestigious West Bloomfield Relays.

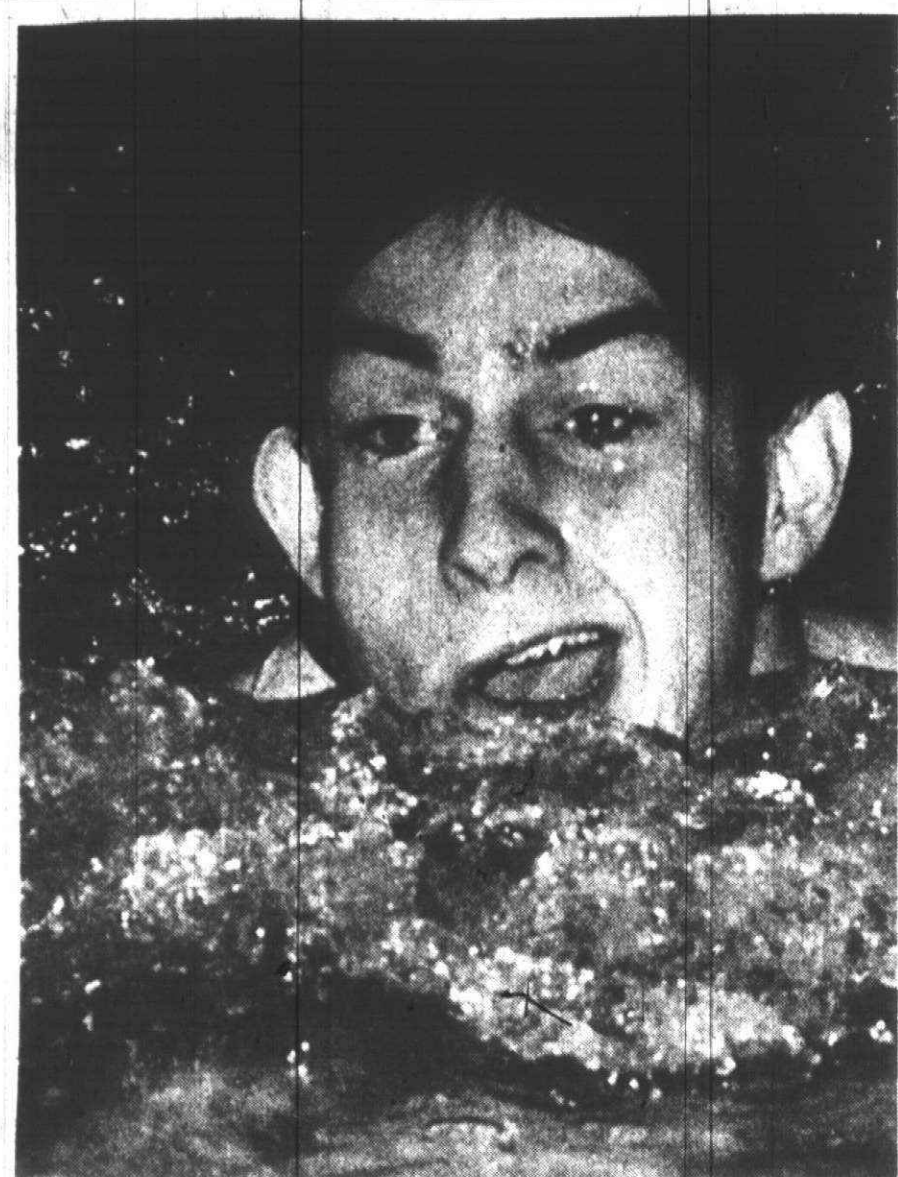

Records tumble in Class A state tilt

Was competition tough last weekend at the state Class A Girls' Swim Finals?

Do birds chirp? Do bees sting? Do cats meow?

The field was so strong and the competition so keen in East Lansing that neither Livonia Stevenson nor Livonia Bentley placed as high as their coaches had hoped.

Stevenson coach Lois McDonald, who was aiming for a fourth-place showing in the team standings, watched her Spartans place sixth.

Bentley coach Keith Wright, who was hoping for a finish somewhere among the top 12, saw his Bulldogs land 20th.

Bloomfield Hills Andover claimed the state title with 180 points. Ann Arbor Huron was a close second at 154.

New state records were set in seven of the 11 events. Two national records were shattered and three Michigan State University pool records were broken.

The amazing thing about the times is that the seniors won only two of the 11 events.

"The performances this year were just awesome," Wright said. "It was really exciting. It was very, very impressive."

Both Wright and McDonald said that their swimmers felt the pressure surrounding a state final.

"I have a great bunch of kids. They just tightened up," McDonald said.

MOST STEVENSON swimmers recorded their best times of the season. Sally Rozman, a senior, placed

fourth in the 100-yard backstroke with a clocking of 1:01.9 and ninth in the 200-yard individual medley with an effort of 2:17.2.

This was the third time that Rozman has placed in the backstroke at the state meet during her high-school career.

Mary Rozman, a sophomore, finished fifth in the 50-yard freestyle, 24.6 seconds, and ninth in the 100-yard freestyle, 55.0.

Jackie Cogo, a junior, placed sixth in the 200 IM with an effort of 2:16.4 and eighth in the 100-yard breaststroke

with a swim of 1:09.9.

Cogo set a new Stevenson school record with her time in the breaststroke.

Beth Nolan, a sophomore, finished 12th in the backstroke with a time of 1:03.6.

The Spartans' 200-yard medley relay team of Polly Adzema, Cogo and the Rozmans placed third and set a school record with a clocking of 1:53.14.

All of those times except Cogo's in the IM were personal bests of the season, McDonald said.

Stevenson also qualified its 400-yard

but the quartet of Karen Biermann, Sue Hollman, Adzema and Nolan did not place.

Hollman also competed in the 200-yard freestyle and 100-yard butterfly, but did not place.

BENTLEY'S talented freshman, Jenny Fedor, placed in both individual events in which she competed during her first state final.

Fedor finished seventh in the IM, 2:14.9, and eighth in the 100-yard butterfly, 1:01.0.

Bentley's other two individual qualifiers — Julie Westhaus in the butterfly and Ann MacIntyre in the 200-yard freestyle — did not place.

Neither did the Bulldogs' two relay teams.

The medley foursome consisted of Dee Powell, Jean MacIntyre, Westhaus and Fedor and the freestyle quartet of Laura Pomeroy, Powell and both MacIntyres.

"I can't complain at all," Wright said. "There was really a harvest of talent out there."

SHELLY MORSE, from Redford Township, also qualified for the Class A finals. She did not place in the breaststroke.

Terri Eudy, from Plymouth Salem, did not place in the 100-yard freestyle.

Patty Elker, a diver from Clarenceville, qualified for the Class B finals at Grand Rapids Junior College. She also found the competition to be strong there and did not place.

Area performers advance in skate competition

The stars of Lisa Hipple, a Birmingham resident; Theresa Romano, who lives in Livonia; and Nancy Berghoff, from West Bloomfield, are on the rise.

Those three figure skaters will take part next month in the Midwestern Sectional in Minneapolis, Minn., a competition sponsored by the United States Figure Skating Association.

Hipple, Romano and Berghoff all finished among the top three competitors in their respective classes last week during the Eastern Great Lakes Regional in Plymouth.

Hipple, 16 years of age, placed first in junior ladies. That's getting old hat for her, now. "I won the same competi-

tion last year," Hipple said. "It was harder because they (competition) improved."

Romano finished second in senior ladies. Romano, 18, also qualified for the Midwestern Sectional last year as a senior.

"I think if I do my best and skate on the level that I'm capable of, I think I have a good chance to make the nationals."

Berghoff, 19, and her partner, Jim Bowser, a Westland resident, were first in senior dance. This is the first major competition which the two have won. Berghoff and Bowser have been skating together two years.

All three have been skating at least eight years and devote at least 20 hours per week to practicing their sport.

"**MY STRONG POINT** would be consistency," Hipple said. She finished first at Plymouth in compulsory figures, first in the short program and first in long program.

Hipple, who belongs to the Detroit Skating Club in Bloomfield Hills, is a junior at Bloomfield Hills Andover, but doesn't spend much time around the

school. "I go to school for one hour, then I go skating."

Because she skates 30 hours per week, there isn't much time for extra-curricular activities — other than skating.

ROMANO, a Livonia Churchill graduate, said she practices five hours per day, six days per week. She belongs to the Academy Figure Skating Club in Woodhaven.

"I skated a nice short program (in

Plymouth), but my long program was a little shaky," Romano said. Still, she prefers the long program to the short program or compulsories.

"I don't feel as much pressure on me," Romano said. "I don't feel I have to do everything. With short program and figures, there are certain things you have to do."

"My goal is to make the nationals," she continued. "I set that goal a long time ago."

Romano said she is willing to skate

competitively another couple of years.

BERGHOFF, who graduated from West Bloomfield, originally skated as an individual, but prefers dance now. "It's easier now for me to skate with a partner than by myself because I'm used to it," she said.

Hipple, Romano and Berghoff have grasped that first rung. There is no guarantee on the steadiness of their hold and dreams, but all are anxious to continue the climb.

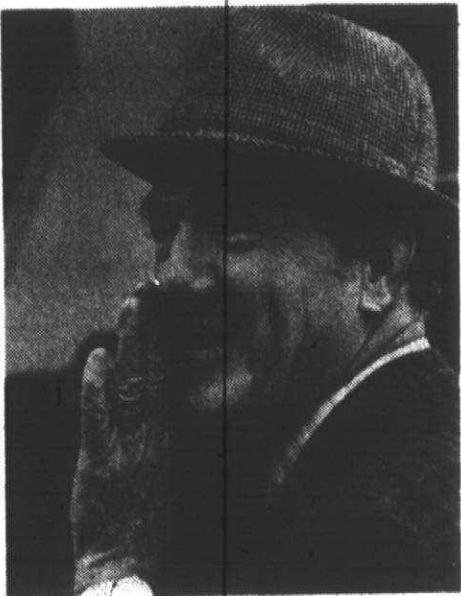

Sarin's wind ensemble plays to work hard

Musically, our society has a way to go.

Such is the contention of Irving Sarin, a Livonia resident who directs the Sarin Symphonic Wind Ensemble, based in Southfield.

The ensemble is a newly formed group of gifted high school- and college-age musicians.

"In Europe any town over 20,000 has an opera of its own," he says. "In Israel, the orchestra plays in the Mann Auditorium, a huge hall, and is always sold out."

"There's a lot more room for good performances. And what we're doing is trying to get an audience for kids who are working very hard."

Sarin's ensemble will present a concert at 3 p.m. Sunday at Southfield-Lathrup High School auditorium. Tickets are available at the Southfield Civic Center, Harmony House and Tel-Twelve Mall. They are \$4 for adults and \$2 for students.

Rehearsals have been under way for weeks now in preparation for the performance, which will feature oboist Arnold Mariotti.

He will perform an original transcription of the Handel Oboe Concerto in G-Minor. There will also be brass and woodwind selections by Gabrieli and Haydn, as well as works by Ducas, Holst and Milhaud.

"Having been a professor, I think it's good for young people to be associated with someone who has been with a symphony," Sarin said.

"THIS KIND of training has been lacking.

"Our group's purpose is to give the youth a chance."

Born in Providence, R.I., Sarin came to this area in 1951 to teach at Michigan State University.

For more than 20 years the first trumpet player in the Pittsburgh Symphony, Sarin lived in Israel in the 1950s and returned there recently.

"I went to play with the Israel Philharmonic," he said. He and his wife, Anne, teach privately. They have four children.

Sarin began studying the trumpet at age 9 and attended the New England Conservatory and Juilliard School of Music. He has played in the National Symphony and the Boston Pop and has made more than 60 recordings with the Pittsburgh Symphony.

There are presently 55 musicians in the new ensemble, but Sarin said they often break up into smaller groups such as woodwind quintets.

"That gives people a chance at musical experience," he said.

More than 50 percent of the ensemble are women, including the assistant conductor, Laura Foltz, a graduate student at the University of Michigan.

"WE HAVE our own arranger and conductor, Joshua Cheek," Sarin said. "Students come from every metropolitan suburb and even beyond."

He said there are several amateur composers and conductors in the group.

"We're always open to new members," he said. "What we're hoping for is to get so successful we'd get prominent soloists and perhaps perform on Channel 56."

Sarin emphasizes that discipline is extremely rigid for the musicians.

"Anyone not open to that kind of rigid situation needn't apply," he says. "I come from the tradition of Reiner and Toscanini, who believed that nothing great can come from a relaxed atmosphere."

"We already have to compete with football games and SAT tests."

And finally:

"If we prize our youth and our culture as we say we do, we should give such a group prominence."

backgammon

WHAT IS A BACKGAMMON?

Janet C. of Livonia asks, "What is a backgammon in the game of backgammon, and how do you play for it?"

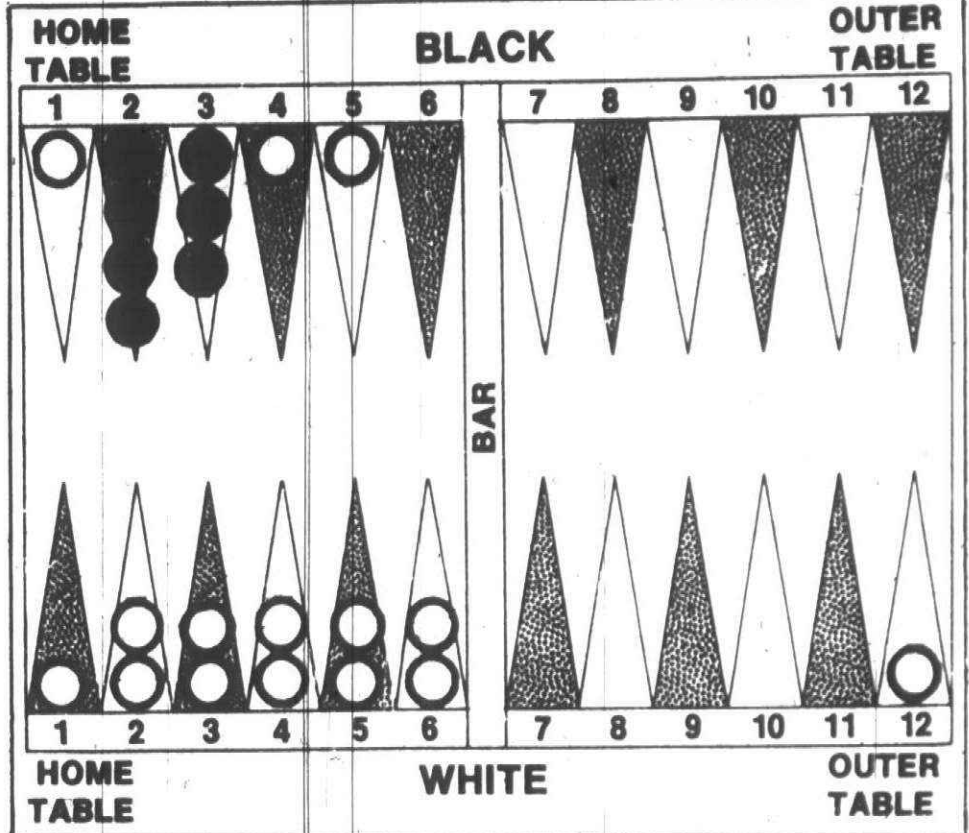
Winning a backgammon is the "elite" when playing a game of backgammon. It happens, but not very often, mostly by luck. The only time you win a backgammon is when you are finished bearing off and your opponent has one or more checkers in your home board or on the bar.

Winning a backgammon triples the point value of that game. Since winning each game is worth one point for the victor, a backgammon would triple the score for three points. If the doubling cube had been turned to 2, a backgammon would triple the cube for a six-point win.

A "gammon" doubles the point value of the game being played. You "gammon" your opponent when you are finished bearing off and he has not yet borne off any checkers — even if he has them all home.

I wish there was a way you could "play on" for a backgammon (triple score), but I haven't yet found it. By rolling extremely perfect dice while your opponent has perfectly terrible rolls, it can be done.

In the example, black rolls a 4-1. Although he has to leave a shot, depending on how he plays it, he may backgammon white.



How would you move the 4-1? Many would bear off a man and hit on the 1 point. Good, but not so good. If white stayed on the bar, unable to re-enter on the 4, 5 or 6 point, you may not be able to cover the 1-point blot. You could also roll double 3s, 4s, 5s and 6s and leave a double shot, or double 2s for a single shot.

But here is where you could play for the backgammon. By moving a checker from the 3 to

the 2 point and bearing off one from the 3 point, you leave the same odds for a shot. But now your distribution is perfect for a backgammon (if you are not hit). Roll a double 3 or better and you get four off. Unless your opponent rolls a large double right back, you are a favorite to win a backgammon on your next roll.

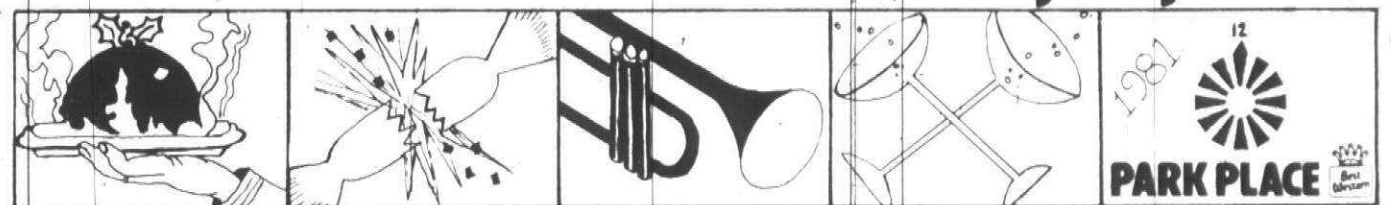

Subtlety marks photographic exhibit

"White on White," an exhibition of high-key photographs in which highlight areas clearly predominate, is at the New Pierce Street Gallery through Jan. 3.

A world of shadow hardly exists in this room of shimmering images, some of which hardly look like photographs. You see white and off-white, delicate edges of gray, but not black and rarely any charcoal.

The images range from famous "Eleanors" by Harry Callahan and equally well-known orchids of Imogene Cunningham to photographs by lesser names. That is where the exhibit's interest lies.

The directors of the gallery, photographers themselves, have shown their good taste in their selection of new and almost new talents. Anyone can show an Ansel Adams if he has one, but directors Marcia Boxman, Nanette Carnick and Elaine Yaker have picked out significant new talent.

Most striking is Hiromitsu Morimoto, whose images of shirts hardly look

like photographs, but like shirt essences transferred to cloth-like paper.

MORIMOTO LABORIOUSLY COATS fine watercolor paper with Rockland liquid emulsion and then projects his negatives. Any experienced darkroom worker will recognize that meticulous care is needed for a process like this.

It is estimated that Morimoto takes at least a day to produce two finished pieces. The delicacy of the final product is hard to describe. It is a kind of New Realism, except that no satire is intended. Rather, Morimoto emphasizes the shirtness of the shirts. His large images pull the viewer's eye toward them immediately as you come in the door.

Less magnetic but equally rewarding are the photographs of Eva Rubinstein, the daughter of musician Arthur Rubin-

stein. This New Yorker, who has only been active in photography a short time, has specialized in classical studies of architecture and nudes. In her "Rooms Within a Palace," archway form stands within archway form. "Nude Sitting on a Bed" is a chaste study of the contrast between white body and white sheets.

TWO WOMEN PHOTOGRAPHERS who have recently been making a name for themselves are Olivia Parker and Lilo Raymond. Both are interested in purity of form and delicate textures. But Ms. Parker, whose works are usually toned, wins the prize for originality. Ms. Raymond's studies are beautiful in conception and design, but lack the vitality of Parker's photographs. "Shell Beans" and "Nautilus", for instance, are compelling images. "Shell Beans" is, perhaps, least high key since it has

some almost-blacks, but its stark contrast and predominance of white qualify it for the show. The beans are so arranged that their shapes form a striking and bold harmony. "Shell Beans" is for those who like pictures of food. "Nautilus" pictures the sea shell of that name and does so with grace and masterly firmness. Parker's well-known ballet-slippers photograph is also on view.

Among local photographers the work of Howard Bond is outstanding. A consummately skilled landscape photographer who has studied under Ansel Adams, Bond's semi-abstract "Rat-house Ceiling" and "Arches" are striking studies in form. Bond's mastery in composition is evident. Even more abstract and more "modern" are Lewis Baltz's photographs. Several photos in Baltz's tract-house series are on exhibit. They are stark, slightly dismal in mood but pleasing to the sense of design.

Downstairs deli expands scope of chocolate shop

Inexpensive deli sandwiches and expensive chocolates are co-existing under one roof.

At Noah's Down Under Birmingham Chocolatier (that's right, that's the whole name), downstairs at 149 Pierce, boxes of hand-dipped chocolates share the space with a sit-down deli sandwich shop.

"It's really two separate businesses under one roof," acknowledged owner Ruth Stromer of West Bloomfield. She started selling chocolates almost two years ago, as a franchise for Kron Chocolates.

When she pulled out of the franchise, Ms. Stromer changed the name to Birmingham Chocolatier. When she decided to add a sandwich operation, she named that after her 4-year-old son Noah.

The small, charming shop has an all-white, contemporary decor, with bright green carpeting. Counters and stools along one side are where the deli customers sit.

ONE OF THE most popular menu items is the Miss Piggy Sandwich (\$3.95). Unbelievably, this is a concoction that has "two slices of every meat in the store — 16 counting cheese. And they order them with Diet Pepsis," Ms. Stromer said, with a laugh.

Formerly a high school English teacher, Ms. Stromer had become fascinated with Kron Chocolates, so her husband, a foot doctor, "bought a franchise for me," she said.

"I learned all about chocolates, how to make and hand dip them."

Now that she's added a deli, she has to arrange her schedule to work on the chocolates in the morning, before the lunch crowd arrives for sandwiches.

"It's dry and cool in the mornings and I can start working with the chocolate," she said.

Noah's Down Under Birmingham Chocolatier is an all-women operation. Ms. Stromer said, "I had a couple of

men working here, but it just didn't work out." The shop is managed by Angela Riccardi Whitmore, an ex-nurse.

ANOTHER DELI favorite at Noah's is the Greek Salad, in Pocket of Peta (\$1.90). Peta bread also is used for individual pizzas with cheese, mushrooms and salami (\$1.75).

"Everything is fresh. The manager does all the cooking," Ms. Stromer said.

There are homemade soups daily, chosen from Italian vegetable, beef barley, chicken noodle, cream of mushroom and clam chowder. "They vary daily, two soups and a chili," she said.

Noah's is known for kosher jumbo hot dogs, too, the proprietor said.

The shop is open 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday-Wednesday and Saturday. Sandwiches are served till 4 p.m. daily, except Thursday-Friday when sandwiches may be ordered till 6 p.m. (chocolates are on sale until 7 p.m. both days).

Noah's has tried serving breakfast but that didn't seem to catch on. Lunch business is biggest, naturally, and an early dinner crowd arrives Thursday-Friday around 4-4:30 p.m.

NOAH'S ENCOURAGES customers-in-a-hurry to call ahead, and their sandwich will be waiting when they get there. The deli offers free delivery Mondays-Fridays. The shop also does deli trays and chocolate trays for parties.

Hand-dipped chocolates in wooden boxes range in price from \$5 for a half-pound to \$20 for a one-pound assortment, \$35 for a two-pound assortment and \$50 for three pounds.

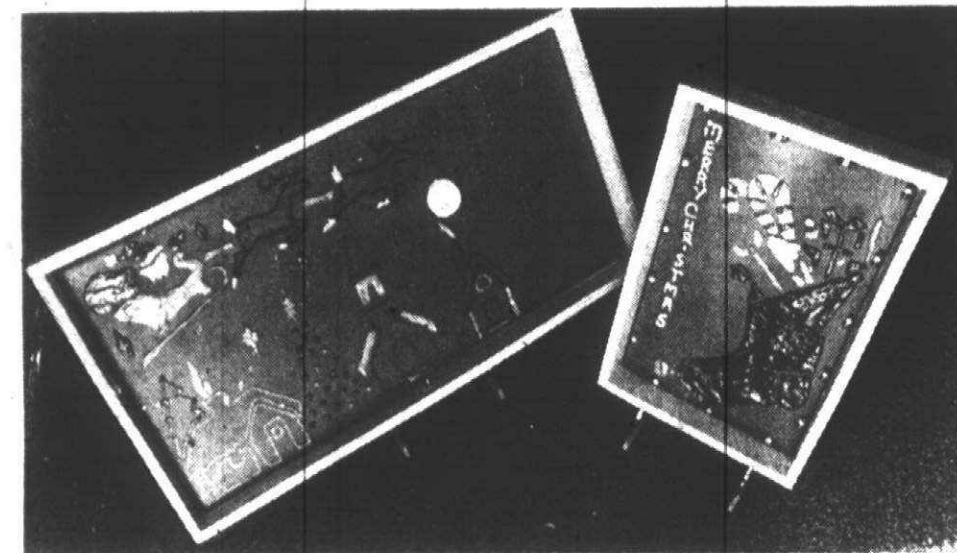
"We specialize in fruits dipped in chocolate, fresh cream truffles, and giant chocolate chip cookies," Ms. Stromer said.

These dairy desserts sit temptingly on the countertop outside the kitchen area, and many deli customers order them to finish off a big sandwich feast.
