### A new park?

### Citizens blast proposed site, board eyes options for grant

The fate of a proposed park in the rolling hills of northwest Canton may be decided Tuesday.

The Township Board could vote Tuesday to accept a \$75,000 grant through the state Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to pay for half of the cost of buying 40 acres of land near Ann Arbor Road and Na-

Dozens of residents of nearby Pilgrim Hills subdivision have voiced vehement opposition to the park plan, which would focus on winter sports such as sledding and crosscountry skiing for children.

A SECOND CHOICE for the board would be to select a different park site and to submit a new application to the DNR before that agency's Jan. 26 deadline for receipt of a new bid, said grants coordinator Terry Carroll.

Two other possible sites are "readily available on the market," said Carroll. Selection would be followed by a public hearing to give residents a chance to air their

One site is a flat parcel behind Township Hall off Canton Center Road and Proctor. The other is a low-lying piece next to the Fellows Creek golf course near Michigan Avenue and Haggerty.

We would probably change our focus from winter sports," said Carroll. "There are no other topographical sites (rolling hills) available.'

According to Carroll, all three sites fall within the township's master plan for areas of future recreational development. The masterplan designation is required under grant guidelines.

Carroll said no purchase prices can be determined until after appraisals are made. He explained the funding procedure as follows:

THE PURCHASE PRICE is to be financed in 50-50 portions by the DNR and Canton Township.

The DNR already has committed \$75,000. Funds will come from the U.S. Interior Department as a reim-

bursement to Canton. Canton's portion will come from revenue sharing funds already earmarked for recreation.

The park would be ready in four or five years, "if that," said Carroll.

In the meantime, the Township Board last Wednesday held a public hearing to explain the Ann Arbor Road location. If the board approves that site, minutes of the meeting will be sent to the DNR, as required for the grant.

The hearing drew more than 60 residents. Questions were answered by members of the Township Board, the planner, grants coordinator, recreation department supervisor and recreation advisory committee.

"WE HAVE been looking at sites for the last three years for (locations) that fit into the master plan," explained Ralph Brickman, former chairman of the recreation advisory committee.


"We got complaints that we only offered summer sports," he added. "(This) site is unique because it's in a high, rolling section of the township. It's because of these features that we chose the site."

Officials explained that the proposed park would be at least 100 feet from the nearest home. It would be a daytime park (no lights) and be locked in off hours.

But Pilgrim Hills residents expressed concerns about toilet facilities (the area lacks city water and sewer lines), noise and wear-andtear on nearby dirt roads.

"I am against any recreation sports," said Kay Chappell of Thorn-

### Switch in post office is near

A move to speed up Canton's mail service and cut crowding at the Plymouth Post Office will take effect on

On that date, Canton mail delivery will be shifted from the Plymouth branch to existing postal facilities in Wayne and Westland.

"There could be some changes in delivery time due to patterns of travel on the routes," said Dennis Nott, manager of customer service at the main post office branch in Detroit.

"ALL BUT six carriers will come with their routes," added Nott, a Canton resident. "The average resident won't know that we did it (moved)."

Undelivered packages and special mail which are returned to the post office will go to the Wayne or Westland branches rather than to Plymouth, Nott

John Mulligan, postmaster for Plymouth, and Nott, explained the move at a recent meeting of Canton's Township Board. A letter outlining the changes is scheduled to go out this week to 16,500 homes and businesses in Canton.

"It will relieve a space deficiency" at the 8,500-square-foot post office on Penniman in Plymouth, said Nott, whose area of responsibility includes the city of Detroit, and Wayne, Washtenaw and Monroe counties.

"I think we will be better able to handle the larger volume of mail that Canton gets," he added.

NOTT SAID Canton mail with ZIP code 48087 (north of Cherry Hill) will be handled at the post office on Wayne Road north of Ford in Westland.

ZIP code 48088 (south of Cherry Hill) will be delivered through the postal facility on Newberry at Michigan Avenue in Wayne.

Canton residents who have post-office lock boxes may transfer to the Wayne or Westland branches or remain with the Plymouth facility for up to a year, Nott said. Box numbers should be included on correspondence to avoid

THE MOVE will fill Canton's delivery needs for an estimated 15-20 years, said Nott, citing a postal study.

But officials now are exploring the possibility of a postal finance unit in Canton. That would mean window and box service only.

Canton officials have been talking about a post office in the township for at least five years.

"A few years ago, when gas was cheap, we consolidated (delivery facilities)," Nott said. "We're looking at where the revenue comes from. If we need a unit there, we will put it there."

Nott said local postal officials have been reviewing the possibility of a unit in Canton since September. A final decision will be made at the state or re-

gional level. "I think there is a need for us to do something," Nott said. "We're reviewing the revenue end of it - we're just about there. It's strictly economics.'

Last week, the Township Board charged the farmland preservation committee with preparatory work for another ballot request on a development rights millage.

Board members have said that an Despite little hope for a federal election should be held within the year farmland preservation grant, township unless non-local funding of a development rights program is found. The amount and date of the millage request still is undetermined. In 1978, voters narrowly defeated a four-mill request (\$4 per \$1,000 assessed property valuation) to fund the estimated \$16 million

cost of a development rights plan. Carroll sees re-introducation of a bill already defeated twice by Congress as Canton's only hope for funding of the

The bill, introduced in 1978 and again in 1979, would have provided grants to communities with innovative farmland preservation programs. The 1978 bill died in committee. The 1979 bill was crushed by a vote of the U.S. House of Representatives.

"But it doesn't look good, especially with such a budget-minded Congress as this is going to be," said Carroll of the bill's chances for re-introduction.

Linton, who holds a contract with

Canton for Washington lobbying efforts, will be looking for a possible sponsor for the bill. According to Carroll, Linton also will

investigate the availability of a small grant to fund studies and work of the farmland preservation committee.

"We're talking about a couple thou sand bucks - maybe \$5,000 maximum," Carroll said.

### Malden TV role takes cues from O&E's 'Stroller'



The newspaper reporter role that Karl Malden played in the CBS Tuesday night movie "Word of Honor" last week was influenced in part by the true-life attitudes and exploits of W.W. "Eddie" Edgar, an Observer & Eccentric newspapers columnist and report-

A CBS spokesperson said the crew filming the story of a newspaper reporter involved in a First Amendment isshe discovered Edgar while looking for sites for the movie.

This led to Edgar being adopted as a role model for some of the characterization of a small-town newsman, according to a press release sent out to some 1,500 newspapers and radio and television stations.

Edgar, 83 and something of a local



legend, has been a working newsman most of his adult life. He left high school in his freshman year to work a a machinist for Bethlehem Steel Co. but shortly after he joined his hometown newspaper, the Catasaugue Dispatch, as a sportswriter. Newspapering has been his first love ever

EDGAR SYMPATHIZED strongly with the role played by Malden — that of a reporter who went to jail rather than break a confidence to reveal the source of a story.

He told a CBS staffer, "I believe strongly in 'word of honor' - I would never break a confidence. I go on the theory that if you don't want it printed, don't tell me.'

In his 60 years of reporting, writing and editing, Edgar has a wealth of memories: covering the Dempsey-Carpentier fight, the football careers of such as Gus Dorais and Red Grange, riding with Gar Wood when the race boat driver set a world speed record of 124.85 mph on Lake St. Clair, riding with Indi 500 winner Wilbur Shaw and covering and guiding, in part, the career of Joe Louis, and many others.

Edgar was at one time sports editor of the Detroit Free Press and he started many sports programs to help Detroit area youngsters. For the past 20 years he has written for the Observer newspapers and his column, The Stroller, recounts many of his experi-

In addition Edgar has been active in a host of civic and community affairs. A resident of Livonia since 1938, Edgar served on the city charter commission and on the first city council. His participation in community activities prompted Livonia to name its winter sports arena after him.

LIKE THE character portrayed by Malden, Edgar has stuck his neck out for such things as word of honor.

There's nothing like it in the movie, but over Eddie's desk in the Plymouth Observer office, there's a cartoon of a turtle creeping along, with this message: "Consider the turtle. He makes no progress UNTIL he sticks his neck

That's been his personal philsophy as he traveled down the journalistic trail,

"A mutual partnership aimed at improving health, education, nutrition, population planning and economic development is the best path to improved relations, and long-term U.S. interests," he said.

Pursell also expressed his belief that the region from Africa to the Middle East has the greatest potential for international conflict in the 1980s and beyond - making it the key area for maintaining world peace.





Before any expansion ideas can be entertained, SEMTA officials will have to figure a way to replace the lost revenue. Krause said a referendum drive on public transportation may be forthcoming soon.

If the public does decide in favor of public transportation, more definite means of funding will be examined.

"We're in favor of it, if they have stopping points within Nankin Transit Commission (NTC) boundaries - Inkster, Wayne and Canton along the tracks," Glenn Shaw said. Shaw is on the board of directors of the NTC, which provides small-bus service primarily for the handicapped and elderly in Westland, Wayne, Canton, Garden City and Inkster.

The NTC has been extremely successful during its 31/2 years of operation, Shaw said, with nearly one-quarter-million passengers riding on its fleet of 15 buses (see related story).

THE NTC is just one of the programs financed by SEMTA. A commuter-rail system from the Renaissance Center in Detroit to Pontiac transports 3,000 people each day, SEMTA General Manager Larry Salci said.

At present, SEMTA officials have had studies conducted on the feasibility of an Ann Arbor-to-Detroit commuter system and costs for its operation, fuel, maintenance and employee hiring and

Problems that still have to be ad-

dressed, Wolfe said, include: · Railroad traffic on the tracks, which could wreak havoc on a commuter-train schedule. During the train trip back from Ann Arbor on Thursday, traffic problems delayed the Amtrak

train for more than 20 minutes.

· Contracts with both Conrail and the unions on operating the system. Amtrak, the passenger system associated with Conrail, has an inter-city service, including a run between Ann Arbor and Detroit. Some sort of an agreement will have to be reached between SEMTA, Conrail and Amtrak.

· The construction of six stations, re-

furbishing of another station and reconstruction of tracks from the Detroit train station to Joe Louis Arena. Ann Arbor, Detroit and Dearborn are the only stops on the proposed line that


currently have operating stations. · A place to store and maintain the equipment. Wolfe said a site west of

Ann Arbor is under consideration. The tracks the system will operate

on generally follow Michigan Avenue to Ypsilanti. From Ypsilanti to Ann Arbor, the tracks wind along the Huron

Wolfe said the trains would be able to reach speeds in excess of 70 mph in many parts of western Wayne County. Within Dearborn and Ypsilanti city boundaries, speeds would be slowed to 45-50 mph. Each train would pull three cars, Wolfe estimated, with each of the bilevel cars carrying 160 passengers.

Three different levels of service are being studied: eight round-trip trains per day (four in the morning, four at night), 12 trains per day (six and six) and 18 trains with round trips in the morning, at noon and in the early and late evenings.

### County's bond power assists local economy

During its first full year of existence the Economic Development Corporation (EDC) of Wayne County has approved an estimated \$30 million worth of construction projects in the Plymouth-Canton area.

And as a result of the EDC's intervention to help developers obtain financing for new projects and expansions, the agency has helped generate at least \$1 million in additional property tax income in Canton, Plymouth and Plymouth Township, according to the

Three projects with an estimated construction value of more than \$7 million have been closed out in Plymouth Township. Current projects include six more in Plymouth Township worth about \$23 million, one in Canton worth \$310,000 and one in the city of Plymouth worth \$310,000. Both Plymouth and Canton also have their own Economic Development Gommissions working to approve expansions and new construction.

In 1980 the EDC issued almost \$8.5 million in tax-free revenue bonds for six projects, creating 135 additional

jobs and retaining an additional 108.

The completion of these projects will bring an additional \$315,000 in new taxes to the county, municipalities and school districts involved.

The remaining active projects of the EDC, however, will generate more than 3,500 jobs and more than \$4 million in new tax revenues upon completion, a spokesman said.

DC projects will bring in an estimated additional tax revenue of \$716,000. There is no estimate yet on how much tax income the current projects will

FitzPatrick, executive director of the county EDC agency upon releasing the group's annual report for 1980.

"When you consider the fact that 1980 was our first full year of operation, we have made significant progress," added Gary Bingamen, chairman of the board for WCEDC.

FitzPatrick said the best indicator of success is the large number of inducements for revenue bonds and loans which the EDC has provided to finance the construction, expansion or renovation of industrial facilities, commercial centers, restaurants, office and medi-

cal buildings, and sports facilities. The EDC was chartered in 1978 and began selling bonds for private industry in 1979. It has been operating now for 18 months.

### Assessment test results show student progress

There's a lot more to taking tests than just the number results students produce. That's the opinion of Dr. Clarice Stafford, an assistant superintendent in the Wayne-Westland district who heads the curriculum department.

Test results help teachers and administrators to "look at what the needs of kids are. We're not concerned with comparing results school to school," she said.

"Kids know more than we can ever assess. This (testing) helps bring out their resevoir of competence," Dr. Stafford added. "We have to have high expectations for kids. Not the same expectations for all, but realistic ones so they can feel successful."

BESIDES GIVING the Michigan Education Achievement Program tests as required by the state, the Wayne-Westland district also administered the California Achievement Test for the first time this year. MEAP is given to students in grades four, seven and 10. The CAT is given to students in grades two. four, six and nine, as well as to students in compensatory education programs in grades one, three, five, seven and eight.

Dr. Stafford said both testing programs evaluate how well students are learning to apply the skills they learn in the classroom. The students' skills, however, actually are measured through periodic tests given by classroom teachers.

These testing programs actually amount to "external audits" of students, according to Dr. Stafford. The MEAP gives a statewide comparison, while the CAT provides a nationwide compar-

The California test measures about two-thirds of a student's skills, compared with about one-third measured by the Michigan test, Dr. Stafford explained. While the district pays for the CAT program, the state covers most of the costs of the MEAP

Both testing programs evaluate skills in math and reading. CAT also measures language useage.

SINCE THIS IS the first year that the CAT has been given, there are no comparisons available to check student's achievements from year to year.

"You don't begin a testing program; you build one," said Dr. Stafford. "Preliminary results are encouraging," said Dr. Stafford in a

report to the board of education.

Test results show that students nearly match the national norm at every level. Variations range from 1.1 grade levels above the national sample in language mechanics at the fourth grade to a 0.7 grade level variation below the national norm in ninth grade reading vocabulary.

Dr. Stafford said that one-half a grade level is considered the standard error of measurement.

While students are "consistently above the national average" in the sixth grade, Dr. Stafford said her department will concentrate on bringing up reading vocabulary test scores in the

"I'm not faulting the junior highs," explained Dr. Stafford. "We can do it. There's nothing romantic about it. It takes time and a commitment to develop knowledge and a speaking vocabo ulary so students can bring it to the page.

### Wayne-Westland schools

The district serves southeast Canton.

"We listen and speak before we learn to read," she added. Now the CAT will be used to set goals and objectives in the curriculum department, to help in placing individual students, to help teachers evaulate programs, to aid long range planning and to provide information for special programs run by the

CHANGES IN THE MEAP test make it a "more accurate reflection of our math program. It's (the test) now more difficult. I'm delighted," said Dr. Stafford.

The increased difficulty in fourth grade math test is reflected in test scores which show a drop of nearly 10 percent in the number of students who knew 75 percent or more of the test objectives.

She said that administrators are pleased that the test shows that efforts to provide compensatory education are working. A review of test scores from 1974 and then from 1978-80 show a steady decline in the number of students who could master less than one-fourth of the objectives tested in reading and math.

That means that more students are learning more of the objectives tested each year. The number of students mastering more than 75 percent of the objectives on the test also is rising.

Dramatic increases are seen in seventh grade math where the percentage of students knowning at least three-fourths of the objectives tested rose from 48.1 to 65.7. And in 10th grade reading, 57.8 percent of the students in 1979 knew at least 75 percent of the test objectives. In 1980, the percentage of students in that area rose to 72.8.

DR. STAFFORD contends that it's legitimate to "teach to objectives tested if those objectives are valid." She rebuffs those who criticize so-called teaching to the test.


"We remind students of what they know," she explained. "We go through warm-up exercises. Afterall, you don't go into running exercises full tilt.

"Students will be taking tests all their lives long," Dr. Stafford added. "They have to perform their best in any situation where they're asked to perform."

But she cautions parents not to place too much emphasis on "You have to look at over time how you're doing," she said.

"You have to be patient and work hard." Parents should have received letters from the school district explaining the testing program. Individual profiles explaining how students did on the tests will be shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences, according to Dr. Stafford.

### Troubled youth find home at area teen center

Mention the term "Youth Living Center" and see what kind of images are

Government-funded places for gangs of kids that have no where else to go. Staffed by social workers. Hospital-like enviroment, with hospital-like shifts of workers. Strict rules and guidelines. All for kids who are charity cases

living on welfare.

Now take a look at what it's like at the Youth Living Center (YLC) in West-

The image is shattered when executive director Ron Scott explains that groups, which wanted to donate things to the center, were refused.

"We don't accept them because then the kids will get the impression that they're different, that they're charities," Scott said.

"We keep telling them that they're not. They're no different than any other The YLC is a unique concept for

youths who are abandoned or abused, "They don't have a history of delin-

tion, including malnutrition. "They don't have any kind of a fami-

ly that can care for them."

Most have already spent time in different foster homes. It didn't work out, so the state referred them to the YLC.

The center opened last March and has been so successful it is planning to open another home next door this

"HOME" IS THE key word for the YLC. Because that is the key to its success — the ability to create a home-like atmosphere for the youths.

Like in any other home, parents lend that air of permanence. The home is run by house parents, Bob and Cathy Balligan. Neither is a social worker.

Bob's background includes running religious camps. Cathy, an occupational therapist, has also worked in camps.

The home the Balligans are in charge of houses eight youths between the ages of 13 and 16. "All are local kids, mostly from

western Wayne County."

To add to the homelike atmosphere, Scott said the house is bought and paid for, instead of leased. The youths aren't faced with the possibility of moving every year or so. The Balligans are the only supervisors, instead of a rotating

The house parents go through extensive training, and the program is designed to be attractive to house par-

"It's very tiring," Scott said of the house parents' job. "The national average for house parents is less than a year. If we can get them to stay on three years, that'd be great.

"But it's devasting to the kids when house parents move in for two or three months and then move out."

THE HOME, unlike other such places, houses both boys and girls. It's all in keeping with the YLC's main theme - to create a family-type home

for youths who never really had one before.

The youths are allowed to remain living at the home until they are able to live independently or they can be reunited with their biological family. Sherrill Reeves, the YLC social worker, works with the families to help reunite

The YLC is licensed to take children as young as 6, but adolescents need their service most, Scott said.

There are no other homes in Michigan with the same concept as the YLC. The program is modeled after homes for children called The Villages, founded in Topeka, Kan., in 1969 by Dr. Karl A. Menninger.

The Villages Inc., now operates 10 youth homes - five in Topeka, three in Lawrence, Kan., and two in southern Indiana. YLC employees are being trained by Village representatives. Although the YLC hasn't paid anything for the training as of yet, Scott said in the near future they will begin to pay \$1,000 a year to The Village for its ser-

STATE CUTBACKS have affected nearly all state-funded programs in Michigan.

"We don't expect that," Scott said concerning possible revenue cuts, but admits he's a little nervous.

According to Scott, 95 percent of the

operating costs for the YLC are covered by state money. The state provides \$15 per day for each child, which does not cover employees' wages. But building and starting-up costs must be privately financed.

How high the start-up costs can be is reflected in the YLC budget for the fiscal year ended Sept. 30. Most of the expenses are based on less than a full year of operation, since the home didn't

open until March. Personnel costs were just under \$48,000. Non-personnel expenses were nearly \$62,000. Much of the non-personnel costs dealt with start-up expenses not reimbursed by the state.

State money paid for \$52,400 of services. Private sources had to make up the rest - more than \$57,000.

The YLC is in the midst of a \$78,000 fund-raising drive for its second house. Scott said one-third of the money has been collected. Foundations, such as the J.L. Hudson Foundation, which recently donated \$5,000 to the YLC, are biggest contributors.

Helping search for possible financial backers is the YLC Board of Directors, which includes 24 community and business leaders such as State Sen. William Faust; D-Westland, and Dr. Timothy Dyer, Wayne-Westland School Superin-



### Did charter group violate open meetings act?

The Wayne County Charter Commission last week conducted interviews in private with candidates for the job of executive director. A two-hour discussion of the finalists was also closed to

A state attorney says that appears to be a violation of the Michigan Open Meetings Act.

Charter commissioners voted 19-5 to close the Thursday meeting.

After nearly two hours of discussion in private, the commission opened its meeting for the eventual election of a new executive director, William H. O'Brien. But during the open meeting, there was no discussion of O'Brien nor any of the other three candidates nominated, suggesting that such discussion had taken place behind closed doors.

THE MICHIGAN Open Meetings Act, which covers public bodies at the state, county and local government levels, allows four topics to be discussed in closed meetings.

One legal reason that meetings may

be closed is "to review the specific contents of an application for employment or appointment to a public office when the candidate requests that the application remain confidential."

Charter Commission President George Ward, D-Detroit, said Thursday that none of the applicants for the job of executive director had requested that the group close its meeting.

However, Ward, an attorney, said a discussion of the candidates' qualifications "may be done in 'executive' session." During a break in the closed session, Ward admitted to reporters that the group had "no (copy of the Open Meetings) statute in front of us."

The law allows for open meetings and closed meetings but not for what Ward termed an executive meetings.

In response to a description of Thursday's meeting, a state assistant attorney general said Friday that the charter commission may have closed its meeting illegally.

"IF THEY didn't have a request (from an applicant), it appears they are probably in violation of the law," said John Wernet, an assistant attorney gen-

"The present law requires, in order for there to be a closed session, that

there be a request from the candidate." Ward said Friday, "I didn't even think of the triggering request. If I did (wrongly interpret the law), I'm not going to concede it because I'm not sure I'm wrong.

"You guys (reporters) are doing a lot to undermine my confidence . . . what more can I say?

Wernet said closed individual interviews with 10 executive director candidates conducted Jan. 5 and 6 "seem to comply" with the Open Meetings law, since the commission's nine-member interviewing group was less than a quorum of the 27-member commission.

According to Ward, the personnel screening committee, which conducted the interviews, was a sub-committee of the commission and not bound by the

Open Meetings Act. Commissioners Darneau Stewart, D-Detroit, and Roman Tafelski Jr., D-Inskter/Westland, who co-chaired the commission's interview committee. said Friday that no candidates had requested a closed meeting.

### Candidate speaks out

### How would executive function?

Rather than make policy, the new executive director of the Wayne County Charter Commission says his job will be to "keep the show going."

"With 27 commissioners, there's plenty of policy makers," said William H. O'Brien, 60, of Detroit, who was hired last week. "They don't need me to interject my thoughts there."

O'Brien, an attorney, is executive secretary of Civic Searchlight Inc., a non-partisan group that rates political candidates' qualifications.

He received 14 votes, a bare majority, Thursday to win the charter commission's top administrative job at an annual salary of \$42,000.

The commission, which will propose county government reorganization, has until mid-June to draft a charter. The full-time executive director will hire the commission's staff, oversee research, prepare materials for the commission and, according to O'Brien, "keep the show going, as it were."

O'BRIEN WAS chosen on the third ballot over Ligens D. Moore, 38, of Detroit, a lawyer for the Detroit Board of Education. Moore received four votes, , all from Detroit commissioners. Eight commissioners - six from Detroit and Highland Park and two suburban representatives - abstained.

Eliminated after the first two ballots were both A. Edwin Dore, 33, a researcher for the Michigan Senate Democratic Majority office, and Sinclair Powell, an Ann Arbor consultant.

O'Brien's 14 votes were from nine suburban and five Detroit commissioners. His supporters included Commissioners Ethelyn Bankes, R-Livonia; Justine Barns, D-Westland /Garden City; Bart Berg, R-Plymouth/Canton; Timothy Manning, D-Redford Township; and Roman Tafelski Jr., D-Inkster/Westland, co-chairman of the personnel screening committee which interviewed 10 candidates for the job.

Detroit commissioners supporting O'Brien included Commission President George Ward, interview committee co-chair Darneau Stewart, Thomas Watkins, George Orzech and John Fitzpatrick.

O'BRIEN SAID Friday he was "at first, a little taken aback" with being elected by the bare minimum vote.

"This is politics," he said. "You expect things like that. I'm not distrubed

"I feel the abstentions were not nec-

While he hasn't held a prior government job, O'Brien said he's "always been on the fringe" of local government. He has served on Detroit school board and city task forces.

O'Brien wrote in his job application that county reorganization has been "at the top of (Civic Searchlight's) list of

Charter commissioners voted 24-2 to demand that during his year as executive director, O'Brien sever all ties with Civic Searchlight, Neighborhood Taxpayers Alliance, a Detroit citizens group, and any group taking positions on or doing business with the county.



### The fury of a homeowner with an unplowed street

Hell knows no fury like a homeowner whose street goes unplowed.

After two years of mild weather we here in Michigan must have forgotten that winter means snow and plenty of it.

The cardinal complaint most frequently spouted hereabouts has been the alleged tardiness of work crews in getting to the subdivisions with snowplows.

It makes me chuckle. People want less government interference but more snow removal services. Somehow they don't consider snow removal as interfering with their right to shovel out their streets.

HAVING LIVED almost all of my life in a city that places snow removal on the same pie-in-thesky list as polishing the fire hydrants, I can dredge up a few occurences now filed away upstairs that taught me more than any driver's ed course, thanks

to unplowed residential streets.

Just about everyone who wasn't born in suburbia knows what becomes of streets that are left to the elements. Two narrow ruts eventually are fashioned out of the snow by the traffic. The ruts are presumed to be of the one-size-fits-all variety, but woe were you if years back you had a compact car. The tires couldn't in their wildest four-ply studded dreams follow the taylored swath of a wide-track

If you owned such a vehicle, you know that one tire drove down the street in a rut while the other banked on a crest of snow about six inches higher. It all made for a kind of teeter-totter effect

THIS OFFERED a number of challenges.

There was always the possibility of meeting an oncoming car. If both parties were amenable, the drivers usually would give up one rut each and thereby allow both to assume the teeter-totter position until both cars had safely passed each other by. But as sure as there's snow in Michigan, you always ran into someone who thought he was better than you and would refuse to relinqish a rut.

You had two choices: You could abandon both ruts and hope you didn't get stuck in the piled snow, or you, too, could hold your ground and sit unmoveable in the ruts, hoping the other guy thought you meant business. I personally recommend the second treatment. It's especially effective if you squint and drive a battered, 1955 pickup with twin I-beam bumpers.

THEN THERE were the sidestreet intersections when the east-west ruts merged into the northsouth ruts to form a sheet of ice. The safest route was to duck into a well-shoveled drive to avoid a confrontation. Sadly, many a clutch met its demise

Long before I learned to drive, I discovered the value of the ruts for another purpose. From where we lived it was quite a hike to the skating rink, and during the school year you could only walk there on the weekends. After the Pontiacs plowed through and the snow in the wide-tracks got packed down and turned to ice, we donned our skates in the evenings and glided up and down the block. This didn't perfect your figure eights, but if you did your crossovers correctly you could get from rut to rut.

# How secret meetings can get off the track

Pardon me if I feel like a prophet.

When the Michigan Legislature was drafting what is now the Open Meetings Act, I asked the House committee to prohibit any topics from being discussed in secret or else to keep the list as short as possible. Florida's law permits no exceptions.

The reason: Once a closed meeting gets rolling, the members want to move on to other subjects.

That was my theory, and it has turned out to be true in practice.

TAKE THE REDFORD Union Board of Education's little closed session last week to discuss a lawsuit it faces in a sex discrimination case. That's allowed under the Michigan act.

Sitting in the lobby quiet as a mouse, with no piped-in music to fog the air, Redford Observer editor Lynn Orr was able to hear the board go beyond merely consulting its attorneys on a lawsuit, as allowed in the Open Meetings Act. The board 1) made a hard decision ("We already have a majority") and 2) discussed the Open Meetings Act itself.

Supt. Robert Juhnke wondered aloud about what

to say to "our little friend Lynn Orr." His choice of words reveals much about his state

of mind. If I were to describe Ms. Orr, I would try words like experienced journalist, editor, graduate of the University of Michigan; maybe mother, homeowner and taxpayer; maybe one-third of a

But not "our little friend." She's tough as nails, as many of us MBAs in three-piece suits have learned

THERE IS A second weakness in the Open Meetings Act as it is actually implemented by our local boards and councils.

The law permits certain specified topics to be discussed in secret, but it doesn't require they be discussed in secret.

In practice, most boards automatically go into closed session every time they get the chance. They never ask themselves, "Is this secrecy really necessary?"

The late Arch Vallier, when serving as a Schoolcraft College trustee, used to make the argument for openness. Once when the SC board was about to close its doors to discuss labor negotiations, Vallier

"Let's leave the doors open. We're handling public money. Let's let the people and the union and anybody else know how much we have to spend. It's

the smartest thing we can do - let the people know."

No one argued with Vallier. They just closed the doors anyway.

The Vallier types are rare. Plymouth Township has one in trustee Lee Fidge, who has made a point of walking out of closed sessions when she smelled violations of the Open Meetings Act. She gets ostracized by her fellow public servants for her observance of a law many politicians dislike.

The Lee Fidges of politics are doing the voters a gigantic favor. They deserve encouragement and a kind greeting.

I HAVE ONE thought to offer anyone — reporter, voter or student — who is told by a public official that a board did something in secret "on the advice of our attorney.

Rest assured you are being dealt with dishonestly. The Open Meetings Act is so plainly written that one almost never needs an attorney's interpreta-

You must understand the nature of an attorney. An attorney is not God. An attorney is not an archangel or a saint. An attorney is not even a dispassionate legal scholar.


An attorney is a hired gun. An attorney tries to find a way to do what the board wants to do.

Rarely do attorneys know much about the Open Meetings Act. Attorneys know contracts and bonds and liability because that's where the money is.

How else could RU's attorneys let the board drift away twice from the narrow strictures of the Open Meetings Act? How could Oakland Community College's attorneys let trustees drift off labor contract A, for which the closed meeting had been called, and onto contract B?

Don't trust an attorney to tell you what's in the Open Meetings Act, and don't trust a public official who says he has consulted an attorney on the Open Meetings Act. Read it for yourself.

#### GOLDEN CRAB APPETIZERS

6 to 8 ounces frozen Alaska King crab meat 1 pound firm, light-fleshed fish, uncooked

1/4 cup minced onion

3 tablespoons flour

1 teaspoon garlic salt

1 egg

1/8 teaspoon ground ginger

Dash pepper

1/4 cup fine dry bread crumbs Spicy Red Sauce or prepared tartar sauce

Thaw crab; reserve 1 tablespoon liquid. Shred or chop crab. Grind or mince uncooked fish. Add remaining ingredients except crumbs and sauce. Form into 1-inch balls; roll in crumbs. Deep-fry at 375° F. until crisp and well-browned. Drain. Serve with Spicy Red Sauce or prepared tartar sauce. Makes about 36 balls.

Spicy Red Sauce: Combine 2 teaspoons each dry mustard and water; blend well. Add 1/2 cup catsup and 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce; mix well. Makes 1/2 cup.

#### CREAMY CRAB AND **GRAPE KABOBS**

(Not Pictured)

6 to 8 ounces frozen Alaska King crab meat

1 package (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

3 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

2 teaspoons prepared horseradish

1/2 to 3/4 cup finely chopped walnuts About 6 dozen green, red or blue/black grapes

Thaw and thoroughly drain crab. Blend, by hand, cream cheese, Parmesan cheese and horseradish. Add crab; mix well. Chill thoroughly for ease of handling. Form into 1-2-inch balls; roll in nuts. For each appetizer, skewer grape, crab-cheese ball and grape on toothpick. Refrigerate until served. Makes about 38 appetizers.

Easy Method: Crab-cream cheese mixture may be formed into one large ball, rolled in nuts and served with small clusters of assorted grapes.

#### CRAB CROUSTADES

6 to 8 ounces frozen Alaska King crab medt

1 tablespoon butter

1 tablespoon flour

1/2 cup milk 1 cup shredded Swiss cheese

2-1/2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

1 tablespoon lemon juice

2 teaspoons minced chives

1/4 teaspoon seasoning salt Croustades

Thaw, drain and slice crab. Melt butter; blend in flour. Gradually add milk. Cook and stir until thickened. Add cheeses; stir until melted. Add lemon juice, chives, seasoning salt and crab. Fill Croustades with crab mixture. Bake at 350° F. 10 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Makes about 3 dozen appetizers.

Croustades: Cut 3 dozen 2-1/2-inch circles from thin-sliced sandwich bread. Carefully fit into well-buttered muffin pans. 2-3/4-inches wide at the top. Bake at 400° F. 8 to 10 minutes or until lightly browned. Cool. Croustades may be frozen.

# Soybeans are least expensive form of protein

"The cow of China" is a telling synonym for soybeans. Soy products have been a staple in the diet of East Asia for thousands of years.

Oriental cultures have come to depend heavily on the soybean for protein much as we in the United States depend on the cow for our protein. The difference, however, is more than simply one of taste. It is one of philosophy. It is a difference between living lightly on the earth or recklessly consuming her re-

William Shurtleff, who co-authored "The Book of Tofu" with his wife, Akiko Aoyagi, addressed this topic, the relation of soy products to world hunger, when the two appeared in the Detroit area last June.

Having identified hunger as one of the five major crises facing the globe today (along with the spread of nuclear weapons, the population explosion, poverty, and energy), Shurtleff devoted most of his attention to soy products as key protein sources on the planet. A number of factors were listed to support this contention that soy is crucial in the world's food supply.

ONE LEADING factor is that soybeans make the most efficient use of farm land, producing over 33 percent more protein per acre of land than any other farm crop.

By contrast, beef production makes the least efficient use of farmland. Under the feed-lot system used by the United States, 80 percent of all our grain is used to feed livestock. This highly inefficient process returns only 5 to 7 percent of the total protein consumed by a feedlot steer or cow for human consumption as meat.

Another, related factor is that soybeans are the least expensive form of protein available. Meat is the most expensive form of protein available, costing up to 20 times as much as soybeans for the same amount of protein.

At least as important as cost is the high nutritional value of soybeans. They contain no cholesterol, having fewer calories per gram of protein than almost any other food, and pro-

vide complete, high-quality protein.

They can be easily adapted into almost any eating pattern because of the great diversity of soy products available: sprouts, tofu, soynuts, miso, soy oil, and a complete range of dairy products including soy milk, ice cream, cottage cheese, ricotta, cheese and cream cheese - all costing less to produce than conventional dairy products.

SOYBEANS are probably the most perfect farm crop imaginable. They require only simply technology and will grow virtually anywhere - from areas near the Arctic circle to those near the Equator.

Soybean roots even produce their own nitrogen, a factor which is particularly crucial since the price of nitrogen fertilizer (a petroleum product) has quadrupled since the onset of our problems with the oil-producing countries.

Having discussed the politics of hunger, Bill Shurtleff spent a brief period of time at the end of his lecture illustrating the culinary uses of various soy

Perhaps the most familiar of those products is tofu which is soybean curd. A few years ago tofu was rarely encountered in the Western world except occasionally in Oriental dishes or in a rare health food store. It is now com, monly available in grocery stores and is even being considered for distribution by Dannon, a sure sign of acceptance by our culture.

Tofu usually comes in a one-pound block, immersed in water. This water should be changed daily and the tofu eaten within a few days. If you wish to keep tofu longer, it may be frozen and thawed and squeezed dry before using. Freezing results in a more crumbly texture than that of fresh tofu. This is perfect for dishes in which a texture like that of ground chicken is desirable.

In its fresh state, tofu has a spongelike texture and bland flavor. This makes it ideal for combining with other foods.

CUBES OF TOFU can be added to any stir-fried vegetable dish for added protein. Ode to Chang Kung is an interesting example of such a dish. It is a blending of cuisines - the crisp Oriental stir-fried vegetables combine nicely with the soft, Western-style noodles.

Served cold, tofu is similar to the white of a hard-boiled egg and makes or mashed tofu for egg in your favorite egg salad recipe or try the Eggless Egg Salad Sandwich described below. By serving the tofu on whole-grain bread, the protein content of the sandwich can be boosted by up to 42 percent.

The sponge-like quality of the tofu makes it particularly receptive to any flavorful marinades. The simplest and perhaps the best method of enjoying tofu is to serve it chilled and cubed with a flavorful dip, such as the one given below. This may be presented as an hors d'oeuvre, buffet dish, or snack and is particularly good when made with freshly prepared tofu.

ODE TO CHANG KUNG 3 cups (raw) flat egg noodles, cooked in salted water; drained 3 stalks fresh broccoli, thinly sliced 1 large, sliced onion 1/2 lb. sliced fresh mushrooms

1 lb. fresh mung bean sprouts ½ cup each — sliced water chestnuts and bamboo shoots 1/2 lb. tofu, cut into small chunks

2 tbsp. sesame oil 3 tbsp. safflower oil 1/4 cup sherry

1/4 cup tamari

### Glogg is cold weather drink

One of the most delightful cold weather drinks is Scandinavian glogg, a robust and heady blend of liquor, hot wine, spices and fruit. This version contains coconut rum liqueur to impart a welcome tropical warmth to a wintery

GLOGG 61/2 cups (2 bottles) rose wine 1/2 cup raisins 1 thinly sliced orange peel

1 stick cinnamon (about 4 inches) 2 whole cloves 1/4 tsp. ground ginger 2 cups coconut rum liqueur

In a medium-size saucepan, either

glass or enamel, heat wine. raisins, orange peel, cinnamon, cloves and ginger until hot. Strain into a heatproof punch bowl. Add liqueur and stir: Serve immediately with clove-studded orange slices, if desired. Makes 12

delicious sandwiches. Substitute cubed 1/2 tsp. freshly grated ginger (or more, to taste)

> Saute onions, broccoli, ginger and mushrooms in safflower oil until tender. Add remaining ingredients; toss to mix and heat thoroughly. Top with toasted sesame seeds and cashews. chopped scallions and green peppers. Makes 6 servings.

EGGLESS EGG SALAD SANDWICH 11 oz. tofu, mashed

1 stalk celery, chopped

1/2 tsp. dry mustard

1/4 tsp. turmeric

1/4 cup minced onion 1 1/2 tbsp. mayonnaise

1 tbsp. minced parsley

1 tbsp. nutritional yeast ½ tsp. dill leaves

1/2 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. dry mustard 1/4 tsp. celery seed

5 slices whole-grain bread 11/4 cup alfalfa sprouts

Combine the first 11 ingredients in a bowl and mix well, then spread on the bread. Serve topped with the alfalfa sprouts. Makes 5 sandwiches.





cellent choice for those times when you that was quite good. are serving dinner to a large group, either buffet style or at a sit-down party. A green salad, crusty bread or breadsticks and wine round out a tasty menu.

One pound of wide lasagna noodles layered with meat sauce, Italian sausage, ricotta cheese and bechamel 11/2 lbs. ground beef sauce will make 16 to 18 servings. The noodles are available straight or curly, green (made with spinach) or plain.

It freezes well, so it can be prepared in advance then thawed and baked when needed. It can be frozen in one large container and used all at once later, or divided into two or three 2 small dried red peppers, or 1 tsp. smaller freezer-to-oven square casseroles. The size of these would be determined by the size of your family or the number of servings needed for the meal you are cleverly planning ahead. Cook the lasagna in salted water to which you have added two tablespoons oil, or according to package directions. Drain well, stir in a little oil, and keep them warm over hot water.

All the ingredients should be timed so that they are prepared and ready for the layering process at about the same time. The tomato meat sauce takes the greatest amount of time so should be done first

Blanch the sausages in boiling water cheese. for three minutes. Drain and broil till cooked through, about eight minutes.

Peel and discard the skins.

Spread a layer of the tomato sauce in the bottom of a large baking dish or pan, preferably one with sharp corners, about 9x12x3 inches. Or, smaller pans of suitable sizes. Then add layers of lasagna, sausage, ricotta cheese, and bechamel. Begin with another layer of lasagna and repeat until the ingredients are used up, reserving some bechamel for the top of the dish. Sprinkle heavily with grated Pamesan cheese and bake in 350-degree oven 20 to 25 minutes. Remove from the oven and allow to sit in a warm spot 10 minutes before serving. Cut in squares and serve with additional Parmesan

Note: You may use tiny meatballs instead of sausage and use double the the bechamel. You may also add layers of thinly sliced mozzarella or Gruyere cheese, if you wish.

**BECHAMEL SAUCE** 4 tbsp. butter 4 tbsp. flour salt and freshly ground pepper 2 cups liquid 1/4 tsp. nutmeg

Melt the butter in a saucepan, combine with the flour, and cook over low heat a few minutes to cook the starchy taste out of the flour. Stir in the liquid, either hot or cold, and continue stirring until the mixture thickens. Add the nutmeg. Let it simmer for a few minutes. stirring occasionally. If the sauce

amount of tomato meat sauce, omitting should become lumpy, stir with a wire whisk or put it through a fine sieve. To keep the sauce until ready to use, place a piece of buttered wax paper over it.

For the liquid, use any of the following: water; milk; combination of water and milk; chicken, yeal, beef or vegetable broth, or a mixture of white wine and broth; or cream. Any of these will complement the flavor of lasagna. Serves 16 to 18 people.



According to the state Department of Social Services (DSS), administrator of the federally funded Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP), the emergency help will be paid only once this fiscal year to eligible appli-

ALLOWABLE ANNUAL income for applicants ranges from \$4,738 for one person to \$12,600 for a family of four and \$17,390 for six persons. Liquid assets (currency, savings or checking accounts, stocks and bonds) are limited to \$2,000 or less per household, except when one member is age 65 years or

Qualifications for the program are based on the household's income and assets and demonstrated need for immediate help. The program is not limited to welfare clients.

According to federal policy, emergency payments will be considered to two household categories:

· Those out of, or indicating a need

oil, coal, wood or propane.

· Those with an overdue (by at least 30 days) natural gas or electric bill. Payments for electricity are restricted to primary heat source cases, or cases where it is an essential component of the overall heating system such as in. forced-air furnaces.

TOP PAYMENTS will range from \$125 to \$200 each, depending on the household's income. In most cases, payment will be made directly to the fuel supplier.

Emergency energy assistance applications are being handled by local DSS offices and Community Action Agency (CAA) offices throughout the state.

Nearly one-fourth, or \$22 million of the \$96.6 million total federal energy grant to Michigan, has been set aside for the emergency payment program.

Two other parts of the LIEAP program began Jan. 1 - a \$39 million tax credit plan for low-income homeowners and renters and a \$30 million "Supplemental Fuel Cost Payment" to qualifying tax credit and welfare recep-



### 'Mirror Crack'd' appeals to fans of light mystery

Recent movies based on Agatha Christie's mystery novels seem to be establishing a tradition of quality productions. Along with an impressive bevy of stars, they're characterized by handsome embellishment in settings, costumes and location, all smartly photo-

"The Mirror Crack'd" (PG), the latest entry, continues to maintain these standards. Although it is not as picturesque as "Death on the Nile," or as crackling as "Murder on the Orient Express," if you enjoy the conventions of the genteel murder mystery, it might be your cup of tea.

This time the super sleuth is Christie's observant spinster, Miss Jane Marple of St. Mary Mead. The Marple character was once the sole domain of the late Margaret Rutherford, who played her in a charming series of films made 20 or more years ago.

Angela Lansbury is the current Miss Marple, and she wisely redefines the character to suit her own interpretation. Lansbury doesn't mug as outrageously as Rutherford; there's less of the huffing and puffing.

SHE PORTRAYS Marple as much more of a low-key person. However, as she sits, calmly knitting and talking with her nephew, the Scotland Yard inspector (Edward Fox), we know by the perceptive questions that her brain is clicking away faster than her knitting needles.

Actually, Lansbury and Fox carry this film in spite of the presence of some heavy talent. Among the cast are Elizabeth Taylor, Kim Novak, Rock Hudson, Tony Curtis and Geraldine Chaplin. They appear as members of a Hollywood production company shooting on location in England.

The situation allows for a surprising amount of humor in the form of inside jokes about movies and stars. At one time, Taylor looks in a mirror and recites, "Bags, bags, go away; come right back on Doris Day." Hudson does a double-take on that one.

Since the two leading ladies of the movie within the movie -Taylor and Novak — are presented as bitter adversaries, the situation also provides the occasion for them to square off in a battle of barbed putdowns.

Unfortunately, most of the dialogue never lives up to the promise of these engaging encounters, and the plot is not very mystifying. It's not difficult to figure out "who done it," or at least narrow the field considerably.

THE DIRECTOR, Guy Hamilton, has some fun with a creaking gate, a stealthy figure, an ominous shadow. But the suspense is well withing tolerable limits, as Marple and Fox try to solve the mystery of a villager poisoned during a reception for the Ameri-

That "The Mirror Crack'd" succeeds as well as it does is due partly to the presence of attractive vistas — the lovely English country gardens, the village green, the elegant mansion - and partly to the appeal of Jane Marple.

Is she just a small town busybody? Well, when the doctor tells her he will stop by to check on her sprained ankle and relate all the local gossip, she haughtily replies, "Gossip? I prefer to call it a healthy interest in human nature."

Since her healthy interest produces positive results, such as solving murders, who can begrudge it?

# Bandied-about bargains intended to entice you away from the slush

The mailbag is overflowing with inside news from the travel industry. Somebody swallowed the toe in the Sour Toe Cocktail. Cruise lines are offering special rates and announcing new schedules.

Canada has launched a program to welcome Americans who drive across the bridge or through the tunnel. Students are planning exotic travel for the summer of 1981.

Lots of goodies to warm an armchair traveler on a cold winter's night.

There are bargains in the cruise industry, which is feeling the pinch of the recession like everybody else. The Royal Caribbean Cruise Line, for example, is discounting its fare by \$100 on the Sun Viking and the Nordic Prince from Jan. 24 through Feb. 14 sailings. The discount is \$175 per person Feb. 23 through March 7.

Free round-trip air transporta-



tion is included in the Royal Caribbean package. Special fares are also available for third and fourth person in a cabin on all 14-day sailings from Jan. 24 through March 7.

Royal Caribbean is also offering its SunVenture program year-round in 1981, allowing passengers to choose either the first half or the second half of a regular 14-day cruise on the Nordic Prince.

As of April 5, 1981, the line will introduce two new seven-day cruise itineraries on the Sun Viking, which will sail one week into the West Caribbean and alternate weeks into the East Caribbean.

THE ODESSA has also released a new sailing schedule. The ship sails every Saturday through May 1981 from New Orleans on itineraries that include Cozumel and Playa del Carmen in Mexico, Grand Cayman Island and Jamaica.

A special cruise leaving March 28 will also visit Havana, Cuba. They are offering rates from \$545 to \$1,095 per person, double occupancy, and they have a no tipping policy.

A single Trans-Panama cruise will leave New Orleans May 17 for Vancouver, British Columbia, where the Odessa will run sevenday cruises to Alaska through Sept.

On Sept. 26, the Odessa will start a Mexican Riviera run out of Los Angeles. The seven-day cruise stops at Puerto Vallarta, Mazatlan and Cabo San Lucas, ports made popular on the television series "The Love Boat." (The boat in the show is the Pacific Princess, which also does both the Alaska and the Mexican run.)

IF YOU'D RATHER cross the Detroit River than the ocean, you should know about the "Welcome to Canada" program started in the fall of 1980 by the Canadian Government Office of Tourism along with Canada's customs bureau. The program is designed to ease the way for Ameicans who travel into Canada by car.

If you cross at either the Detroit-Windsor Tunnel or the Ambassador Bridge and you are planning to stay at least one night in Canada, the customs officer will hand you an envelope full of information specifically coordinated for this part of Canada.

Separate color-coordinated information slips give you motoring information, shopping tips, metric conversion charts, customs information, notes on where to change your money and how to fill up with gas and lots of other small but important points that can bug a traveler even in a friendly foreign country.

J.A. Carman, known to his friends as Alex, is coordinating this little border-crossing gift as a test run. If it works as well as he thinks it will, government will also design a program for travelers arriving by air and sea.

Just an example: Consult Page 1 of any telephone director in Canada, under the word HELP! or dial 0 and you'll get the police anytime. And: post cards and letters need 17 cents postage in Canada.

ADULT TRAVELERS are finally getting in on the study programs so popular among young people. The American Institute for Foreign Study, traditionally aimed at high school and college students, is offering adult level learning programs that include African safaris

and house-and-garden tours of the British Isles.

Their regular programs, which range from one-week minitrips to Europe and Mexico through two-, three- and four-week traveling programs to three-, four- and five-week overseas campus programs, are still designed for high school and college students.

### Wanted: Unique swizzle stick

Dawson City will never be the same. Somebody swallowed the toe in the Sour Toe Cocktail.

I reported on the Sour Toe Cocktail, an important tourist inducement to the Klondike, when I visited the Yukon last summer. I was there for the longest day of the year, June 21, when the sun shines about 22 hours.

Dawson City isn't quite far enough north to be in the Arctic Circle and can't technically celebrate the midnight sun, yet you could read a book outside practically all night in June.

He didn't want to par't with the toe, however, so he pickled it in a jar of high-proof rum. When the grizzled old prospector died, his friend, Capt. Dick Stevenson, laid all his bones to rest except for his toe bone. He took the toe bone back to Dawson City and invented the Sour Toe Cocktail.

You could have it any night by invitation at the Sluice Box Lounge in the Eldorado Hotel. Captain Dick would take the toe out of its bed of salt, wash it off and place it in a champagne glass. He filled the glass with champagne. You, the victim, drank the champagne down until the top of the glass touched your nose.

Young folks did it, old blue-haired ladies did it, everybody did it, especially if they fortified themselves with three strong dry martinis first. Afterwards, they received a certificate saying they were real Sourdoughs.

IN THE NORMAL run of things, you can't be a Sourdough until you've spent a winter in the Klondike and shot a Grizzly bear. Anyone who drank the Sour Toe Cocktail became an instant Sourdough and could buy a T-shirt to prove it.

All that was before the dastardly deed that darkened the already pitch-black days of winter. A construction worker from Ladner, British Columbia, drank a Sour Toe Cocktail and swallowed the toe.


Before the startled onlookers realized what had happened, the construction worker had slipped shame-facedly out the door and disappeared in them that hills.
