Police force probed for federal fund misuse

Investigation focuses on cadet program

Canton Township could be forced to refund at least \$14,000 in federal money because of possible abuses in pay and jobs performed by police cadets.

The Canton Observer has learned that local and county officials are looking at practices which until recently were taking place within the township's police cadet program. One of those practices includes permitting police cadets — trainees — to do unsupervised patrol work.

In addition, some cadets paid with federal funds may have received wages which exceed mandated guidelines. That money, which probably will amount to at least \$14,000, likely will have to be returned, Canton officials said.

Supervisor James Poole said the police cadet program is "positively" being reviewed by township administrators, members of the township Board of Trustees and county officials who administer the federal funds for cadets' pay.

Also under review is the possibility of future disciplinary action by the board, Poole said. He declined to be specific.

"I DON'T THINK the intent was to hurt or cheat," Poole said. "I think the intent was to put more law enforcement on the street."

Police Chief Jerry Cox would neither confirm nor deny the charges.

"I'm not at liberty to discuss it," Cox said. "It's still an unresolved issue. I'm aware of the issue in general (but) I'm not aware of the specifics."

The Observer also talked with Poole, grants coordinator Terry Carroll and personnel director Dan Durack.

Also interviewed was Arthur Lewis, director of the Wayne County Employment and Training Administration (CETA). That agency administers federal funds from the Department of Labor and monitors its uses by Wayne County communities.

Poole, Carroll and Durack all were somewhat guarded in their comments, because the cadet issue still is being probed.

They confirmed, however, that cadets have been used in one-person patrol cars and that Canton may be required to pay back federal funds.

Poole, who took office in late November, said his investigation showed the alleged violations began shortly after the cadet program was launched last August and continued until February.

The supervisor said it was brought to his attention in January by "three or four department heads and two or three elected officials." Poole said he checked into the allegations, ordered the practice of one-person cadet patrols halted and notified CETA.

"I don't want to embarrass anybody," Poole said. "But it has been going on, and it has to stop."

"You stop it because of potential liability, (and) you stop it because you aren't complying with CETA rules."

EIGHT persons were hired last August as police cadets. All had been screened from an original list of about 150 applicants. Some had patrol experience in previous jobs, while others had taken criminal-justice training.

Under Canton's program, cadets are to advance to police-officer status after about 18 to 24 months. During the training period, they perform mostly routine functions such as typing reports, dispatching runs, learning about equipment.

On occasion they are to be permitted to go out on patrol, provided they are supervised by a regular officer.

Entry-level cadet pay is about \$12,300 a year, advancing to \$12,700 for the second level. Top cadet pay is \$13,500, as compared to \$17,000 for starting pay for a regular officer.

Two of the entry-level cadets have been paid largely from federal funds

Proposals mean \$1.2 million dent in school deficit

If both tax proposals on today's ballot are approved, the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education still will have a deficit of about \$1.2 million.

The ballot in today's annual school election includes Proposal I, which asks an increase of one mill or \$1 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation (SEV); and Proposal II, which is a request to levy the authorized millage rate.

Residents also will elect one member to the Plymouth-Canton Board of

Education for a four-year term and will help elect two persons to seats on the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees.

The polls will open at 7 a.m. People standing in line at 8 p.m. will be allowed to vote.

CANDIDATES for the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education include: Edyth Aninos of Canton, David C. Bone of Canton, Christopher B. Clements of Plymouth, William H. Decker of Plymouth, Stephen G. Harper of Plymouth, Marilyn Rickard of Canton, Ernest Rumsby of Canton and Charles R. Washburn of Plymouth.

Candidates for two six-year terms on the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees, with terms expiring in 1987, include:

Taki J. Anagnostou, Wesley Berry Jr., Richard J. Hayward, Paul Y. Kadish, John J. Pantalone and Laura Toy.

The Plymouth-Canton incumbent is Harper, while the Schoolcraft incumbents are Hayward and Kadish.

THE REQUEST for one additional mill for eight years would produce about \$970,000 in operating income for Plymouth-Canton Schools.

The request seeking permission to levy the full authorized millage is worth about \$262,000, or almost one-third of a mill (30 cents per \$1,000 SEV).

Proposal II, in effect, would reverse the rollback otherwise required by the Headlee tax amendment and allow the school district to levy the same rate it now does. For that reason, it is similar to a tax renewal request.

At one time, the school administration felt Proposal II was worth about nine-tenths of a mill. But the most recent information on tax base (total SEV in the district) suggests the authorized levy would be reduced only by about one-third of a mill if defeated, explains Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business.

"Months ago, we guessed on what the

How to get vote results

Township buys lots for taxes

Builder's error yields park for sub

Canton officials plan to capitalize on a builder's failure to pay property taxes by buying seven subdivision lots from the state of Michigan for \$1.

One or more of the lots on Greenwood will be donated to the Pickwick Village Homeowners' Association for use as a park, Supervisor James Poole said.

The remainder may be sold to the original owner — builder Dominic Mocer — for a still undetermined price.

According to township officials and Mocer, the lots recently were acquired by the state of Michigan because of a delinquent property-tax bill of approximately \$4,200. Mocer said he has not received a tax bill for the Pickwick lots since 1974.

The land division of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources offers foreclosed properties to municipalities

for a nominal fee before auctioning the land off at a tax sale, Canton planner Jim Kosteva said.

Officials of the Pickwick Village Homeowners' Association have expressed interest in the land for use as park, Kosteva said.

LAST WEEK, Mocer appeared before the Township Board with an assistant and an attorney in an effort to buy back the Pickwick property.

Attorney Gerald J. Carnago called the builder's failure to pay the property taxes "a mutual mistake." Township tax rolls do not name Mocer — or any other person — as the owner of lots two through eight in Pickwick Village subdivision.

But Clerk John Flodin said that the absence of Mocer's names on the tax rolls does not exempt the builder from property-tax payments.

Township Board members voted unanimously to buy the lots from the

state of Michigan for \$1. Despite talk of returning some of the property to Mocer, the resolution did not contain specific language regarding negotiations with the builder.

Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz was absent from the meeting.

After the vote, Carnago would not dismiss the possibility of legal action against Canton Township if negotiations do not begin for return of the lots.

"I think the courts will protect us. No one loses property because of a mutual mistake," Poole said.

Poole said the township probably will return some of the lots to Mocer for a sum in excess of the delinquent tax payments. He added, however, that the amount of returned land will hinge on requests from the Pickwick Village Homeowners' Association for use of the land as a park.

"It all depends on the homeowners. This isn't to save Mocer, you know," Poole said. "In this case, we'll wind up

with a nice little park for the subdivision."

Poole added, however, that "I think the fairest thing to do is to give (some of the lots) to the guy who lost them."

ACCORDING TO KOSTEVA, residents of the subdivision east of Lilley and north of Ford could use the lots for a small playground area. Measuring 60 feet in width and 130 to 159 feet in depth, the lots back up to Willow Creek.

The land's flood-plain location has prevented Mocer from constructing homes on the sites, said Robert Blick, executive assistant for Mocer Management Co. in Flint. Last year, however, Mocer installed \$60,000 in drainage improvements in order to build on the lots.

Blick said Mocer learned of the state's foreclosure on the lots by accident.

Police said water skis, a propeller, life jackets, wet suit, fins and a surfboard were taken. Also taken was the cover to the boat.


There were so many things taken that the thief or thieves "would have had to make several trips back and forth," commented Stewart.

# It's final days for residents down on the farm

The residents of the Plymouth Canton Community Schools school farm aren't faring too well these days.

Heather is gone. She has already been led to the slaughterhouse.

Fred and Bob are in need of a home. And nobody's sure about the future of Tasha, one of the homestead's old-timers.

Until recently Heather (a cow), Fred and Bob (kid goats) and Tasha (a 5-year-old dog of mixed heritage, mainly shepherd) all enjoyed the tranquility of their home — the 10-year-old school farm.


But due to budget cuts for the new school year, the farm will be shut down by the end of the month. The remaining livestock will be sold or sent to market.

Plans are already in the works for the farm's closing, the first in its 10-year history. In closing the farm, the district is expected to pare down an anticipated deficit by more than \$40,000. Farm equipment, as of last week, was stored away. The equipment originally was planned for sale, but a parent group scored a last-minute victory on that point. Called the "Save the School Farm Committee," its members petitioned the school board to shelve the equipment with the hopes it someday might be used again.

**THE BARNYARD** is losing its animals. Still roaming free on the grounds were a couple of noisy roosters and Tasha, who has outlasted several farm managers.

The sound of school children running through the display barns is gone. School tours ended the previous week.

"It's kind of quiet without the tours," noted Kathy Smith, the wife of farm manager Mike Smith.

The Plymouth School Farm started up about a decade ago with a contribution of some \$10,000 by the Rotary Club of Plymouth.



administered by the Wayne County Employment and Training Administration (CETA), with the township supplementing a portion of their salaries.

CETA sets a cap of \$12,000 per employee for its portion, and federal guidelines limit the township's supplement to \$2,400.

Grants coordinator Terry Carroll said there are indications the two cadets paid with federal funds may have exceeded their pay scale because of overtime or "working out of (job) classification," such as the patrol work.

Carroll said CETA has withheld payment of \$6,100 to cover the last three months of the cadets' pay. In addition, Canton may have to pay back at least \$14,000 in earlier wages and fringe benefits for the two, Carroll said.

"IT'S GOING to involve a pay-back,"

district's total SEV would be," explains Hoedel. "That guess was based on estimated figures from the Wayne County Bureau of Taxation.

"Since then we have received more accurate figures which change the impact of Proposal II request. Even now, though, our figures still are based on what I've been told over the phone. I've received nothing in writing.

"And we still do not know the losses and additions in SEV for the Washenaw County portion of the school district, although that won't significantly change matters."

Hoedel suggested county tax officials may have expected a much higher increase in SEV because of the equalization by class law, which just went into effect this year.

"What we found, though, was that the law caused residential to increase by quite a bit, but commercial and industrial only slightly, and in some cases it went down," he said.

Hoedel said that residential SEV in Plymouth Township increased by 26 percent while the total SEV increased by 17 percent. "So some classes of property must have gone down in evaluation," he added.

Likewise in Canton, residential SEV increased by almost 19 percent while total SEV went up by only 15 percent.

said Carroll. He said the exact amount hasn't been determined.

"It looks bad for everybody," Carroll said. "My basic goal is to protect the township and to protect the program.

"This serves as an organizational lesson," Carroll added. "Processes have to be controlled."

Arthur Lewis, director of CETA, said an independent monitoring unit of his office has been investigating the case, and he expects a report in about a week.

Lewis said CETA regulations are complex, which often become an "administrative albatross" because of subtle differences in guidelines. He also said the rules are "kind of black and white."

"ALL I CAN SAY is that it appears there may be a violation," Lewis added. "I would hope it turned out it was a misunderstanding, but the fact of the

matter remains — whether you were aware or not."

Poole and other Canton officials praised the cadet program.

But some current guidelines and possible disciplinary action were discussed in a recent closed meeting of the Township Board, which lasted more than two hours. The state Open Meetings Act

permits officials to discuss personnel matters in closed sessions.

Trustee Carol Bodenmiller said there had been hints of possible violations last fall.

"I think they will have to be resolved," Mrs. Bodenmiller said. "It's no

dent. A representative of the builder was conducting other business inside Township Hall when someone mentioned the lots in Pickwick Village subdivision.

Kosteva estimates the market value of each lot at \$12,000 to \$15,000.

According to Poole, sale of the lots at that price would bring little profit to Canton Township. State law requires municipalities to return profits from

such land sales to all taxing units, such as the school district and county. That would leave Canton with only 4 percent of the sale, the supervisor said.

KOSTEVA SAID state foreclosure on land because of delinquent taxes is fairly common in Canton Township.

"But it's rare for them to be developable lots," he said. "Generally, they're real small little slivers."

To the planner's knowledge, town-

ship officials never have purchased such land from the state before.

"I think from now on I'll have my recreation people screen these (for possible purchase of park land)," Poole said.

Ms. Falkiewicz, Canton's treasurer since last November, was on vacation and unavailable for comment on the long-standing absence of Mocer's name on the Pickwick the tax rolls.

Kosteva said he believes the error

He said that all of the current cadets have completed their police-academy training, as required, and there has been some discussion of upgrading them to regular police officers "more quickly than (the current format) would provide for."

"They are capable of performing as (regular) police officers," Durack said.

In the city of Plymouth, residential SEV rose by 20 percent with total SEV increasing by almost 18 percent.

## Quality and expense don't always make good partners

Whoever said what the country needs is a good five-cent cigar ought to see what happens when you offer a \$1 movie.

Lately, going to the flicks means checking the offerings, the calendar and your watch. Going before 5 p.m. the movies cost one price, but bother to eat your dinner first and it may cost you a couple of dollars more on each ticket.

For those who happen not to work on weekday afternoons, matinees can be an attractive escape.

Right now, movie prices in the area vary from the \$1 el cheapo to \$4 a head for the first-run film being hyped the loudest. But price does not reflect quality.

After a hard day's work or hard week's work, I usually opt for skipping the \$1 offerings because the lines are just too long.

Say what you will, I go to the movies to escape a little, and it's easier to escape when no one's shoving me from behind so we don't miss the titles.

Last week, Jack and I went to the movies twice. Once we went twice in one night, but let me explain.

Tuesday evening, one when we both finished work a bit early, we decided we'd go to the 7 p.m. show at the Movies at the Prudential in Southfield.

SOPHISTICATED comedy is a favorite with both of us, and "Four Seasons" is supposed to be a good example.

We left the house in plenty of time, but as we approached the Prudential Town Center, we were faced with a sea of cars. Jack let me off to buy the tickets, but inside was a sea of humanity.

Guess what? The Movies at the Prudential are now a bargain rate \$1.

It seemed as though 39 percent of all the people I know were in line, either to buy tickets or to get into the theater. Those with tickets mainly had bought them about 5:30 p.m., gone upstairs to eat hamburgers or Oriental food, taken their time, and found themselves just small waves in that same sea.

Not for us. We waved good-bye and drove over to the Maple 1, 2, 3 Theatres where one offering was "Breaker Morant."

BREAKER MORANT is the name of one character in an Australian film about an incident in the Boer War.

Most of the movie is centered around the simple courtroom in South Africa where three men are


being courtmartialed on several very serious charges. (I'm being skimpy not to spoil it for you.)

That first movie Jack and I saw last Saturday was "The Outlands." It cost \$4 each for us to see a film touted as a science-fiction, space story. But it wasn't. What an \$8 bore.

As for "Breaker Morant" — it cost us double what the \$1 bargain would have. But for under \$5 including the popcorn, we both agreed it was the best film we'd seen in a long time.

But more expensive tickets don't always translate into better movies.

### All should bear school problems

To the editor:

This letter is intended for the parents of the other children in Plymouth Township currently attending "the only school in Plymouth or Plymouth Township remaining on ESY," Isbister Elementary.

For years we have put up with some problems which the rest of our community refuses to be burdened with. Our community is scheduled around a traditional school calendar, resulting in the following situations for us:

The Youth Enrichment Activities sponsored by our schools are not available to our children. If we would like our children to have an opportunity to learn to swim or learn tennis or golf, or to be on a bowling league, we have to pick them up as soon as school is out and rush them to the activity — if it's even available to ESY children — after a full day of school.

None of these activities are scheduled on our "breaks." In fact there is very little for our children to do on these "breaks" because there are too few children in our community who are out of school to schedule things for. It is even difficult to get together with friends in the community because our children are in school when their's are out, and vice-versa. Our children cannot attend camp. Cottages, boats, pools and lakes cannot be used on most summer days.

We alone in our community have had these problems, and we have had them for years. That is discriminatory. You

may think we can opt out to a TSY school if we choose. I tried that and was told it is only an option in hardship cases. Personally, I'm beginning to feel like one.

I would like the district to take out our air conditioners and install them in each of the other Plymouth schools in turn, for one year each, putting them on ESY. Then ask the parents whether they agree that the whole community should be on ESY or no one should. Ask them if they have enjoyed being out of step with the community in which they own a home and pay taxes, and whether they enjoyed being the only residents of their community penalized for the rapid growth in our school district.

I know that the residents of Canton have many of the same problems, and I don't mean to imply that this situation is fine for them but not for us. However, it is growth in their community which necessitated ESY scheduling, and all of their children are on it, so their community can plan around it.

I was looking forward to some positive changes in our situation when Bird and Fiegel schools joined us on ESY, but the school board has found an excuse not to inconvenience themselves or the other parents involved.

I know that my suggestion can't be implemented. I also know that if there is an equitable solution to our "community" problem, we will have to come up with it, because everyone else is pleased with the status quo.

Why shouldn't they be? We've let them use us year after year to solve a community problem that should be borne by all of us.

Fluffy white grains of rice are combined with raisins, apple wedges, green onions and celery. On this tasty bed, the flaked canned salmon is arranged and a curried mayonnaise tops it all off. America's gift to the world — iced tea — is the perfect accompaniment to the spicy salad.

Another curried recipe from India, Kedgerree, has become a staple entree in England. The artistry of the French to blend flavors by using wines brings another dimension to the salmon and rice combinations in Saumon Au Sherry.

Combine spinach and chopped eggs; set aside. Drain and coarsely flake salmon, reserving liquid. Sauté onion in butter until soft but not brown. Add mushrooms; cook 3 minutes longer. Stir in salmon liquid, wine, dill weed, salt, pepper and lemon juice. Combine with rice and salmon. On lightly floured surface, roll 1 sheet pastry to a 10 x 12-inch rectangle. Mound half the salmon-rice mixture into a meat loaf shape lengthwise in center of sheet, leaving about three inches on each side. Arrange half the spinach mixture over mound of salmon-rice mixture. Draw long edges of pastry together over filling; pinch to seal. Cut off a triangle from each corner, then fold ends like envelope flaps over covered filling. Place a lightly greased sheet, face down, on pastry and invert so that seam side will be down. Repeat with second sheet of pastry. Beat together egg and water; brush over tops of pastry. Cut small fish shapes from pastry trimmings; arrange on top of pastry and brush with egg mixture. Make 2 or 3 slashes on top of each loaf. Bake at 400° for 25 to 30 minutes or until golden brown. Slice each loaf into 4 portions. Serve with clarified butter, if desired. Makes 8 servings.

## Pecan cake recipe won a blue ribbon

Donna Leeson of New Orleans took top honors in a recent cook book and recipe contest with her Praline Pecan Cake. Her secret ingredient was Praline Liqueur.

### PRALINE PECAN CAKE

1 pkg. yellow cake mix  
1 pkg. (4 serving size) instant pudding and pie filling mix  
4 large eggs (at room temperature)  
1/2 cup cooking oil  
1/4 cup liquid brown sugar  
3/4 cup Praline liqueur  
1/2 cup Heath's Bits o' Brickle  
1/2 cup chopped pecans

In large bowl, blend cake mix and instant pudding. Add eggs, oil, liquid brown sugar and liqueur. Beat with electric mixer at low speed until thoroughly mixed, then at medium speed 3-4 minutes. Stir in Bits o' Brickle and pecans.

Bake in well greased 10-inch tube or bundt pan in preheated 350-degree oven for 40-45 minutes or until cake tester comes out clean. Cool in pan, on rack, 10 minutes. Remove cake from pan, cool then glaze and garnish.

### GLAZE

1 1/4 cups sifted confectioners sugar  
2 tbsp. butter, melted  
3-6 tbsp. Praline liqueur

In a small bowl, combine sugar and butter. Beat with mixer, adding liqueur gradually to achieve desired consistency. Pour over cake. Garnish with a few chopped pecans and brickle.

## Re-educate eating habits to cut food budget

While waiting in line at the grocery store last week, I began to talk with the woman in back of me. It was a familiar conversation.

Over loaded carts we discussed spiraling food prices and our inability to hold the line on grocery budgets. Each week the bill climbs higher despite the elimination of frills such as snack foods, pop, high-priced cuts of meat and convenience foods.

Although frustrated, we both expressed gratitude that we are not on fixed incomes or, worse, virtually no incomes, a situation faced by increasing numbers in our state as unemployment spreads.

As a wrap-up to the discussion, the woman expressed a common sentiment: Perhaps the only way to beat escalating food prices is to become a vegetarian.

Unfortunately, vegetarianism is not an inexpensive way to eat, either. Fresh fruits and vegetables, fish, cheese — all have kept pace with increasing meat prices. To put these items on the table can be as expensive as meat — or even more expensive.

IN EITHER case, however, it is possible to scale down. What is required is re-education and a change in comfortable eating patterns.

In the case of meat, this can mean learning to cook "variety" cuts of meat. Chicken feet, pigs' ears, and tails, heart, liver, kidneys, brains, alli-

gators, squirrels, rabbits — all can provide the nutritional equivalents of more common and, therefore more expensive, cuts of meat.

The problem goes beyond that of learning new cooking techniques. A bigger obstacle lies in overcoming the anthropomorphic aversion to eating these readily identifiable animal parts or to eating animals we think of as pets.

Even worse than eating recognizable body parts is the eating of unrecognizable cuts of meat. Imagination takes free rein. Just try asking any man to identify the source of a piece of meat with a suspiciously nondescript name. I can almost guarantee his answer.

THAT BRINGS US to the advantage of a similar shift for a vegetarian. Again, some re-education is needed, some changes in habit are required.

Sardines, high in protein and calcium, might replace higher-priced fish. Those unaccustomed to eating sardines (not a particular species of fish but a variety of tiny, soft-boned fish; in the United States small herring are used), might start out by trying the spread recipe given below from Prevention Magazine.

Prevention suggests that it be spread on slices of crisp, raw turnip or served as a dip — a healthy snack or an unusual addition to a platter of cold hors d'oeuvres. It also makes a nice change-of-pace sandwich filling.

Dried beans might take the place of

cheeses or meat or supplement them. With the exception of kidney beans, there are at least no anthropomorphic associations.

Instead of the variety meats, you will be stewing such esoteric items as soy flakes. Soy flakes (essentially sliced soybeans) cook in a fraction of the time required to cook the whole bean. Once

cooked, they can be substituted in any recipe calling for cooked soybeans (which require an overnight soaking followed by three hours of simmering). Cooked soybeans — either flaked or whole — can be substituted for hamburger in many recipes, providing complete protein without the unwanted fat.

In the recipe given below, for exam-

ple, soy flakes replace hamburger in stuffed peppers for a nutritious, inexpensive entree.

### ZIPPY SARDINE SPREAD

1/2 cup mashed sardines  
1 hard-cooked egg  
1 tsp. lemon juice  
1 tbsp. finely chopped onion  
2 tsp. mayonnaise  
1 tsp. prepared mustard

In a small bowl combine the sardines and the yolk of the egg. Mash together. Add the lemon juice and chopped onion. Combine mayonnaise and mustard, mix well and add to the sardine mixture.

Spread the mixture on a small flat serving tray. Garnish with egg white

forced through a sieve. Serve as a relish with salad greens or as a dip with vegetable sticks or whole-grain crackers.

### STUFFED PEPPERS

Serves 3

3 bell peppers  
2 cups cooked soy flakes  
1/4 cup chopped onion  
1/4 cup chopped celery  
1/4 cup canned stewed tomatoes, diced  
1/4 cup oil  
1/2 cup wheat germ  
Salt and pepper to taste

Scoop out the insides of the peppers. Combine remaining ingredients. Stuff the peppers and bake 30 minutes at 350 degrees on a rack above water.

Dawn Marstan of Livonia, assistant coach in the season being completed, will take over top coaching chores with the beginning team, Al Panackia of the Family Y staff said.


Panackia said all are welcome to attend the open house and try out for the team. Those who are chosen will then need Y membership to participate.

And sometimes they may even be able to practice their sport right side up.




Sherry Jordan of Livonia demonstrates a back walkover on the bar in a practice session for the Livonia Family Y Twisters.




Up and over goes back-flipping Terri Kinsey, Livonia Twister.





Last Monday, the cattle was sold, including Heather, a docile Holstein that had been a favorite among school children. Although pregnant, the animal didn't have a formal milk record which explains why she went to the meat-packers, said Mrs. Smith.

The Smiths, who have managed the farm for the last four years, admit they find it difficult eliminating the animals and closing the farm.

There are pleasant memories, though, said Mrs. Smith. She remembers many of the thousands of children that visited the farm and their wondering eyes as they took in the sight of the animals. She remembers the curiosity and questions of the youngsters. And there have been humorous moments, like the midnight call from one of the security guards at the neighboring CEP (Centennial Educational Park) when a herd of cows decided to take an evening stroll to the high school complex.

ON A BRIGHT summer day last week, one could easily see that activity at the school farm was winding down. The sheep, expected to be sold today, had

not been shorn as is the usual practice at this time of year. "It's not worth it now since they're going to market," said Mrs. Smith. The two small pigs, on loan from an area farm, were scheduled to be sent back. Some school children had laid claim to a few of the rabbits. They planned to turn them into pets. The geese, some of which are descendants of the original flock, will also be sold.

(In case anyone's interested, Mrs. Smith says the birds make excellent watchdogs. For security reasons, the high schools' drivers' education cars are parked near the geese pen. "They had some security problems over at the park," said Mrs. Smith. "So, that's why the cars are parked here. Between our dogs and the geese, the security's better). According to Smith, about 3,000-4,000 children toured the farm each year. Most were in grades K-2. Some of the district's third graders had started garden plots at the farm site, plots that won't be harvested in the fall.

Smith, as well as members of the Save the Farm Committee, believe the farm would not have been axed this year if it had been run differently.

# No doubt about it! Chiefs advance

A sign in the bleachers read: "Plymouth Canton baseball fever — Catch it!"

And with only the state Class A championship left to grab, the Chiefs are moving on to bigger and better things after sweeping two games Saturday to claim the regional crown at Wyandotte's Memorial Field.

Coach Fred Crissey's team, now sporting a glittering 28-2 overall record, defeated a tough Temperance-Bedford squad in the final 6-2. Canton reached the championship with a 9-0 victory over Taylor Center. Temperance, which ended the year at 17-6, beat Dearborn Edsel Ford in its opener, 7-4.

The Chiefs, making their second appearance in the semifinals, will meet Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher (29-8) at 4 p.m. Tuesday at Grosse Pointe North. Canton beat Gallagher earlier in the season, 15-8.

Crissey, who has coached Canton since the school opened in 1972, will savor his second regional trophy.

"At no time have they quit on themselves," he said. "They're together on and off the field. They've decided their priority is to be the best we can be."

"We've never won 28 (games). Before it was 26. We're very pleased."

In the final, Canton exploded for six runs in the fourth inning to break a 0-0 deadlock to put the stubborn Mules away.

With the bases loaded and no outs, Scott Bricker walked to give Canton its first run. The Chiefs made it 2-0 when Fred Rumberger's long fly ball to left field was dropped, scoring teammate Bryan Capnerhurst.

Keith Stone then broke it wide open with a three-run triple over dead-centerfield and later scored on Steve Schumacher's single.

TEMPERANCE rallied in the sixth, scoring two runs. The Chiefs, however, snuffed out the Mules' bid when pitcher Dan Smith wheeled to third base and caught Todd Stoner off guard, tagging him out in a rundown. Mark Sexton, trying to advance to

third, also was gunned down, getting Canton out of the inning on a double play.

Smith, who raised his personal record to 13-0 by scattering eight hits, has won several games this year with his patented move.

"We were going for it on the second pitch," explained Crissey. "The runner got off just enough for us to make a play."

Temperance coach Ron Alvarez disputed the play, charging that Smith had balked. He argued vigorously with the umpire and was subsequently ejected.

"Our kid got picked off — no excuse," said Alvarez, "but he made the move to first to home, not third."

"Canton is a very good team with depth and defense. We hit the ball, but not in the right places."

Steve Bowron, a strapping 6-foot-3 pitcher, suffered his first defeat in two years. He allowed four earned runs on five hits.

IN THE OPENER, senior hurler Dave Malek tossed a five-hitter and fanned seven as Canton drilled Taylor, which bowed out, 15-8.

Malek, now 8-1, averted danger twice. Center threatened with runners in scoring position in the second, third and fifth innings.

The Canton hurler, though, got out the jams on two pop-ups and a double play.

Crissey, who decided to save Smith for the second game, has complete confidence in Malek.

"It wasn't a gamble," said the Canton coach. "Dave's thrown three shutouts in a row. If we didn't have faith in him, he wouldn't pitch. The kid has pitched great."

Taylor coach Frank Avery cited three costly errors for his team's demise.

"You can't give a good team like that a lot of runs and expect to win," he said. "We got enough hits, but it was a matter of hitting in the clutch."

"Canton is well-coached with a lot of enthusiasm. They're among the best we've played."

"I've said it before but the community has to be proud of these kids," said Crissey. "It's an old cliché that was started by the Pittsburgh Pirates — We are like a family. They're very close to each other." And one step closer to a state title.

## Plymouth skater reaches dream

She spends endless hours practicing for a sport which gets little or no recognition.

Kathy Donnelly, 17, a junior at Plymouth Salem, recently attained a level few ice dancers achieve.

Before a panel of judges at the Plymouth Cultural Center last month, Donnelly earned a gold medal from the United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA) as she passed her eighth and final test.

"This level is very high quality," said her coach Gene Heffron, who performed during the 1968 Olympics at Grenoble, France, in an ice dancing exhibition. "The judges are kind of picky, otherwise this wouldn't mean much."

"This puts Kathy in about the top two percent of all ice dancers."

To complete the testing, Donnelly performed the Viennese and Westminster waltz with partner Peter Dalby, also her coach and a former British champion. Donnelly has spent the past 18 months working toward the medal. She had to pass 16 different ice dance routines in order to qualify for the award.

"What you're doing is a design on the ice," explained Heffron. "You have to do a certain number of patterns. Two solo patterns last approximately six to eight minutes."

"It's a very short time. If you make any errors, you're dead."

The sport is set to music and involves a strict tempo and timing.

Nancy Meiss, a world class official from Cincinnati; Peg Faulkner, a USFSA judge from Ann Arbor, and Dorothy Eschman, also of Ann Arbor, rated Donnelly in her final test.

THE AWARD was not only satisfying to her coaches, Dalby and Heffron, but also gratifying to Donnelly herself.

"I'm doing it as an individual," said Donnelly. "I mainly want it for a teaching background."

Donnelly began skating at the Cultural Center in Plymouth six years ago.

"My mother (Carol) got me inter-

ested," said the gold medalist. "I began taking lessons and liked it."

The Plymouth girl spends three hours a day, six days a week at the rink working ferociously at a sport that her fellow students at Salem know little about. Many of those lessons took place at 5:30 a.m.

"The sport teaches self-discipline and self-reliance," said Heffron. "It's an individual sport which gives you a sense of accomplishment and enjoyment."

"The more background she gets, the better teacher she can be."

"Kathy passed a big test. You have to wait 28 days before you can try again if you fail just one of the dances."

Donnelly, who helps defray her skating expenses by working on the Cultural Center's staff, plans to continue ice dancing and hopes to learn more about freestyle skating.

After graduating from high school, Donnelly hopes to further her education at the University of Michigan and work to become a teaching pro.





## Jupiter's moon sets eerie scene for standout film

If "Outland" (R) were about a mining camp out West or even a penal colony at some remote location, there would be little to distinguish the story. The movie would be around for a few weeks and leave without much fuss.

But the setting for "Outland" is a mining complex on Io, one of Jupiter's moons, and that makes a world of difference.

This movie is a triumph of artistic design. Nothing that Sean Connery or Peter Boyle do is half as effective as the dark, forbidding mood established by the sets, the lighting and special effects.

The words and actions of the characters carry added weight and impact because of the impressive designs. From the beginning, they establish this titanium mining complex as an ominous and frightening place.

**WHERE WE EXPECT** automation, we find people who are all too real. Greedy and corrupt, they live in an anti-human, depersonalized environment of metals, plastics and video monitors.

Sleeping quarters for the laborers seem no better than cages for laboratory mice; the cages simply are on a larger scale.

Connery is the federal district marshal charged with keeping the peace in this hellhole. A number of mysterious deaths puts him on the track of illegal shipments of potent drugs.


The immediate effect of the drugs is to increase temporarily the user's energy level. The drugged person, therefore, works harder, faster and produces more. Continued use, however, produces extreme behavior which, on Io, generally results in suicidal actions.

The federal district marshal, in what seems like a reprise of the sheriff's role in "High Noon," has to take on the villains by himself. Except for the gutsy assistance of a woman doctor, he can't count on help from anyone. The workers either "don't want to get involved" or already are involved as part of the drug traffic.

**CONNERY BRINGS** a convincing strength to his character, and Boyle is menacing as the corrupt general manager of the mining complex.

The story moves quickly and maintains nearly constant tension as it erupts with the kind of gore which has become commonplace in movies. "Outland's" contribution to cinematic violence consists of scenes in which bodies explode as a result of instant decompression.

With or without spacesuits, this is a depressing movie in its projection of a future society grown more callous, more inhumane. Nevertheless, striking imagery, action and suspense compensate for the negativism and mark "Outland" as a sci-fi thriller likely to attract large audiences, as "Alien" did.




Con-Am No. 27 is on Io, volcanic moon of Jupiter, in the suspense film "Outland."


