AN INFORMATION

booklet about the township now is available to Canton residents. The booklet, free of charge at Township Hall, is a handy reference for everyone. It contains names and phone numbers of different governmental departments, service groups and organizations. It also includes emergency medical information and announcements about current issues and events in the township.

Township officials hope to periodically publish a small newsletter called "Canton Confidential" for residents soon.

IT'S TIME to check your water meters — that's the message from Canton Supervisor James Poole.

Apparently, many of the water meters in the township are not working properly. The meter reading you may see on your outdoor meter may not be the same reading as the one in your basement. For your own financial protection, it would be wise to call the water department to get a correct reading.

How did Poole convey this advice to the public? Known for his sometimes eccentric sense of humor, Poole decided to use the public-forum portion of Tuesday's township board meeting to voice his complaint.

When Poole called for the public forum, no one at the meeting had anything to say, so Poole strolled out to the audience to the microphone.

If you thought Fire Marshal Art Winkel had anything to do with this contest, you're right. Emergency hospital nears completion

An Oakwood Hospital out-patient facility in Canton will be ready for operation by early October.

Work crews are putting the finishing touches on the interior of the building at Warren and Canton Center roads, said Oakwood administrator David Ippel.

The facility will be equipped to handle emergency cases which don't require hospitalization. There will be no operating rooms and no beds for overnight stay, he said.

CANTON FIRE CHIEF Mel Paulun estimates the new Oakwood facility will be able to provide immediate care to 85 percent of the persons who now are transported by fire department rescue vehicles to nearby hospitals.

According to Paulun, the department made 545 rescue runs during the first six months of this year.

There currently are no hospitals in Canton. Most rescue patients are taken to Wayne County General in Westland or to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.

Upon request of the patient, the department also will transport to such hospitals in Annapolis in Wayne, St. Joseph or Bevet in Ypsilanti and others.

It takes about an hour for a rescue rig to transport a patient to a hospital and to return to the station, according to Paulun.

"**WE'RE CERTAINLY** pleased," said Paulun. "It will save us a lot of time and give us more manpower. They (firefighters) will be back a lot faster."

The Oakwood facility will provide 24-hour emergency service. Ippel said patients requiring hospitalization will be transferred to Oakwood Hospital in Dearborn or other full-service hospitals following stabilization.

A suite of physicians, whose specialties include obstetrics, gynecology, family and internal medicine, will be at the Canton site. There will be a pharmacy, a laboratory and X-ray service.

Ippel has had one meeting with Paulun to discuss services. He said he plans also to meet with Canton firefighters within the next few weeks to "talk spe-

cifically about what (the facility) can and can't do."

THE NEW out-patient facility will be hooked up to a special area-wide communications center at Wayne County Hospital. Firefighters en route to Oakwood can call through this system to discuss the medical needs of the patient.

Paulun said two of Canton's fire department rigs currently have the hook-up, which also is connected to other area hospitals.

Oakwood broke ground on its \$1.5-million out-patient facility in Canton last fall. The Michigan Health Department earlier had approved plans to construct the satellite medical facility.

An eight-person committee of Canton residents, officials and business persons has been involved in the planning.

Ippel said the Dearborn-based Oakwood Hospital decided to build an out-patient facility in Canton because of the township's "insufficient medical resources" and growth.

"It's a process that has been going on about three years," said Ippel. "There didn't seem to be any organized move to meet those needs."

Fire guts vacant house

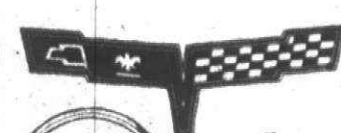

School farm vote expected

The safety committee will be recommending a safety busing program for the '81-82 school year. Safety busing is that busing provided to students who normally would walk to school but are transported because of hazardous conditions, such as construction in new subdivisions, no sidewalks, or having to cross expressways.

The district does not receive financial reimbursement from the state for each student bused who lives within 1.5 miles of their school. For that reason, the district has been trying to reduce the number of students bused for safety reasons, a number which has increased steadily from 1974-75 until a reduction

was made last year.

The number of ineligible students bused had increased from 1,031 in '74-75 to 1,792 in '78-79, with the loss of reimbursement increasing from \$12,448 to \$43,563.

In 1979-80, the number of ineligible students bused was dropped to 1,756 with safety busing costs dropping to \$42,688. The safety committee for '81-82 is recommending only 1,053 ineligible students be bused, which would lower this coming year's cost of safety busing by \$25,600.

The largest reductions in the number of safety busing passengers recommended are: Hulsing, 50; Erickson, 198; Field, 222; Gallimore, 88; Lowell, 274; and West, 42.

Additional members have been named by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education to its series of advisory panels.

The school board has formed a 12x12x12 citizen advisory committee structure which involves 12 separate committees assigned topics to study for

12 weeks with each group expected to have 12 members.

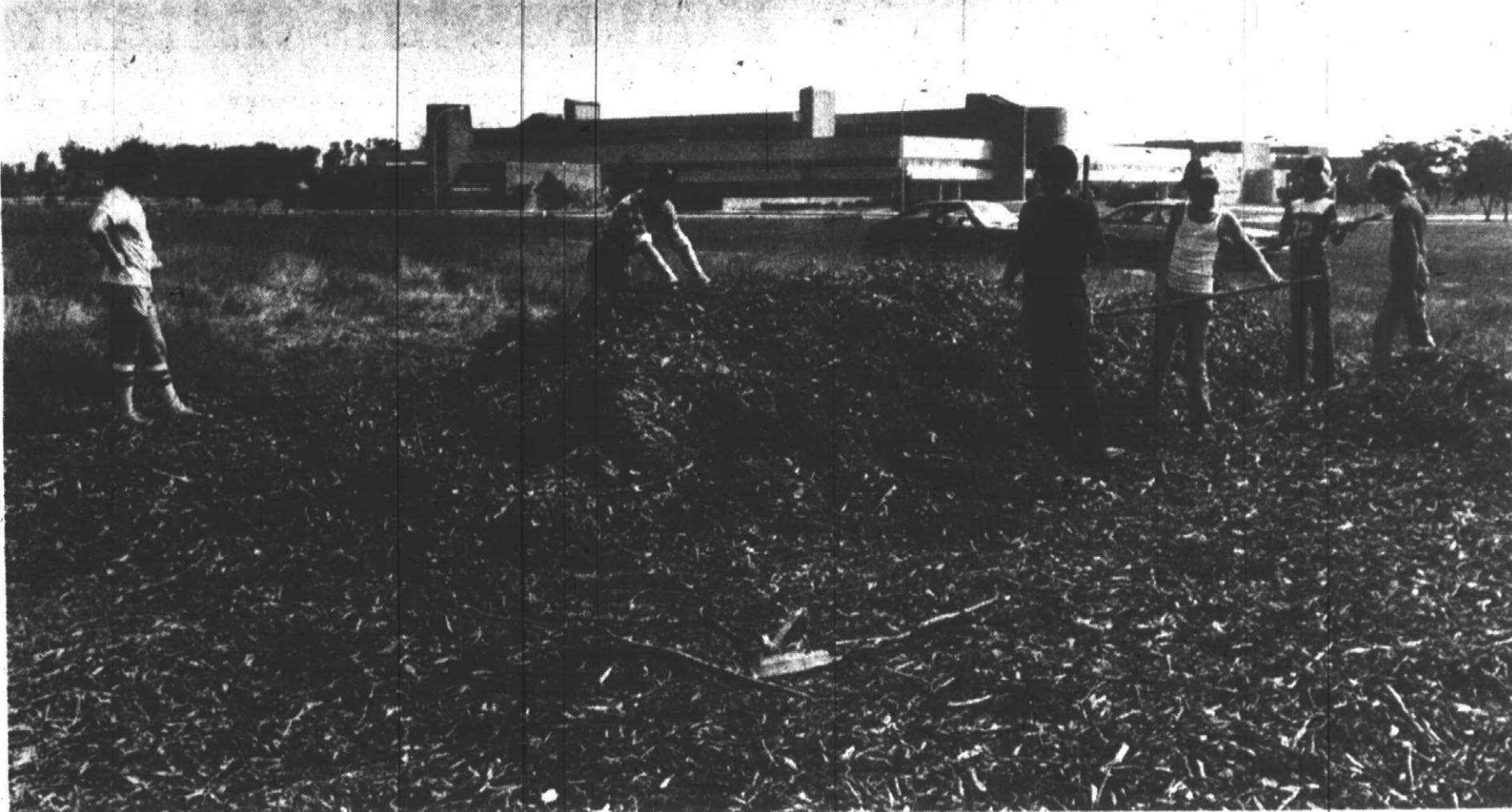

A distance runner's delight!

Distance runners take note: The Centennial Educational Park may have its own five-mile cross country course next summer.

But there's a catch.

Partial construction can't be completed unless someone donates woodchips, which are used as base for the running surface.

The cross country track is one of many jobs handled by students in Project SCORE (Student Career Opportunities through Relevant Experiences).

The local SCORE program, coordinated and directed by Plymouth Salem High School teacher Byron Richardson, performs chores at the park — everything from painting doors and locker rooms to building a natural trail.

Two summers ago, Richardson's group took on the project of constructing a trail in the wooded area in the southwest corner of the park complex at Joy and Canton Center.

This summer, Richardson's group is tackling construction of a cross country facility that both Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton teams

can use for practice and meets. It may also be open to the public.

"Our idea was to have a place for kids and people in the community to run," Richardson said. "You're always endangering people when they're running on the road."

"It will give them a place to run, and it's beautiful — with the trees and the woods."

PART OF the proposed course will include an overlap of about one-quarter mile with the natural trail, Richardson said. The first two miles of construction, which may be finished by the end of the week, is along a field behind the school farm, west of Salem High School. The rest of the course will wind around the athletic area, south of Salem and west of Canton.

"The plan is to eventually make this five miles long and then hook up workout stations with chin-up bars, dip bars and a place to do situps," Richardson said.

Currently, both Salem and Canton cross country teams practice and hold meets at Cass Benton Park in Northville.

The problem, however, is finding people to donate woodchips for the course. Livonia's De-

partment of Public Works (DPW), Lathrup Village and Wayne County Road Commission all have donated chips, but more are needed.

Richardson said that if his group gets enough woodchips they would finish two miles of the course by this weekend.

"Woodchips are very good to run on," he said. "They're soft, and you won't get shinsplints from running on them. They're one of the best running surfaces."

RICHARDSON HAS 18 SCORE program students working on the course. And they love it.

"The kids have a lot of fun doing this — they do a good job," Richardson said.

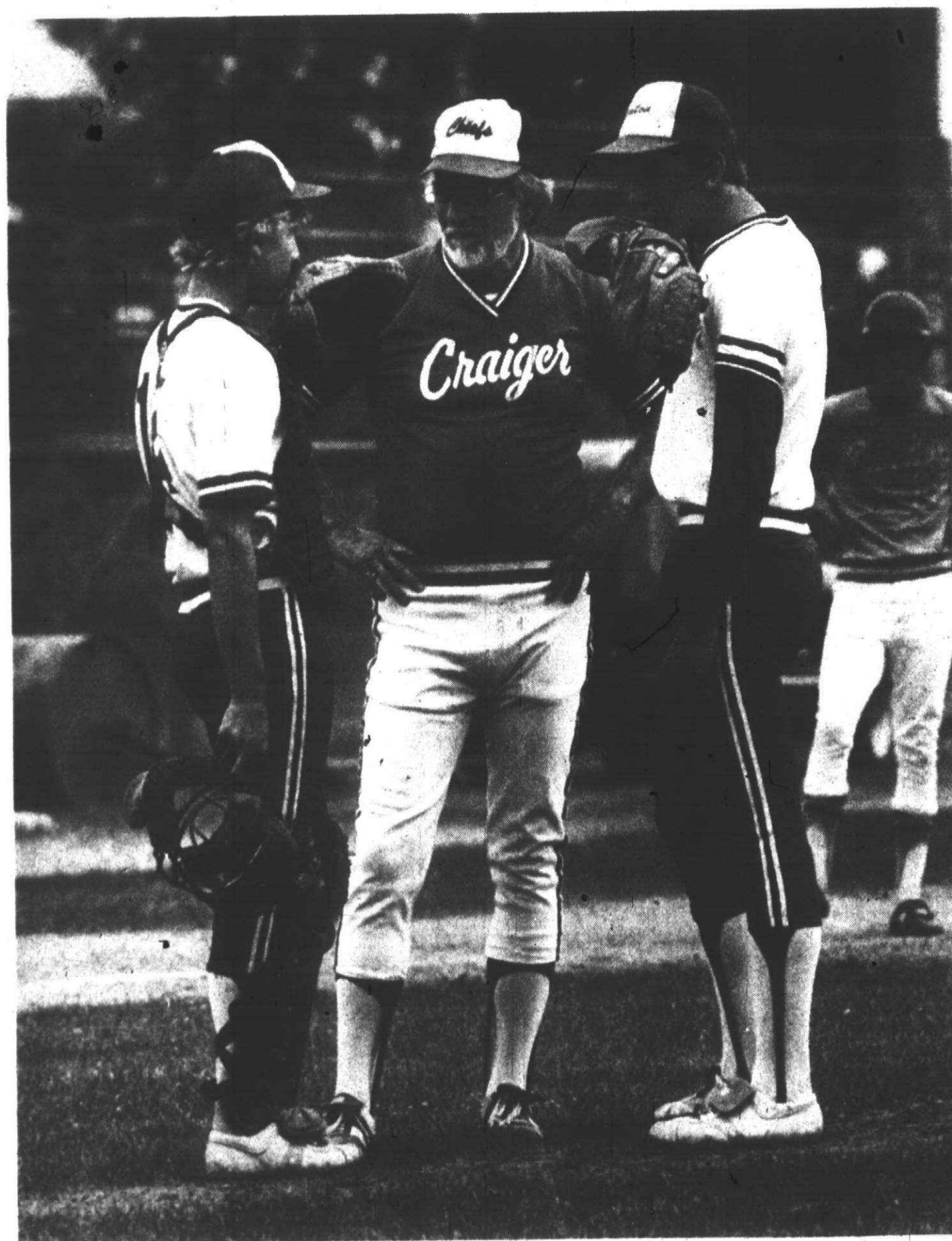
This is the ninth year Richardson has been involved in SCORE, a federal program funded through the Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA). SCORE offers employment for disadvantaged youth, giving on-the-job training and teaching good working habits and attitudes. For the first time in nine years, the SCORE program won't be operated after school this fall because of cuts in CETA funding, Richardson said.

Poll reveals inflation concerns

Local residents made it clear in a congressional survey they want the government to do something about inflation and job protection.

In a survey of 14,000 families in Garden City, Westland, and Canton Township, and the southeast corner of Livonia, U.S. Rep. William D. Ford, D-Taylor, reported that inflation was a runaway "favorite" in the list of important issues cited by residents.

Half of the 14,000 families answering the survey said inflation is the nation's most serious problem. Unemployment was next with 24 percent, followed by taxes with 22 percent.

Residents in Ford's 15th congressional district also favored mandatory wage and price controls if the economy doesn't improve. Another 33 percent opposed controls.

On a series of questions on foreign trade and imported cars, 38 percent of those answering Ford's annual poll said they supported "legal limits on imports (including cars and other products) to protect American jobs."

Another 33 percent preferred the U.S. negotiating a voluntary trade agreement with other nations with America increasing its productivity through tax and regulatory policies.

RESIDENTS ALSO indicated they opposed basic cuts in the Social Security retirement system while favoring

cuts in some of the fringe areas of the program.

Nearly half, or 49 percent, favored maintaining the minimum benefits of \$122 per month.

But those answering the survey also favored by large margins other Social Security program benefits.

Some 57 percent said the government should cut the \$255 death benefit if there is no surviving spouse or children.

Another 54 percent felt that the Social Security payments made to adult students between 12 and 22 who are offspring of retired, disabled or deceased workers be cut.

In a continuing mood to cut some of the fringes out of the retirement program, 53 percent favored a tightening of eligibility requirements for disability payments.

HOW DO WESTERN Wayne County residents feel about federal spending by category?

In the largest numbers, 49 percent want more spend on crime control; 42 percent back more spending on aid to the elderly; while 41 percent prefer more dollars allocated to energy research.

In announcing the results in a newsletter to residents, Ford, in the House of Representatives for 18 years, said:

R 317.182.9. Plymouth Township; hunting restricted in certain area.

Rule 9. Hunting with, or the discharge of, a firearm, except a shotgun loaded with shot not larger than No. 6, is unlawful west of a line described as follows: Beginning at a point where Ann Arbor Road enters Plymouth Township in Section 31; thence northeasterly on Ann Arbor Road to Ridge Road; thence north on Ridge Road to the corner common to Sections 19, 20, 29, and 30, T1S, R8E; thence west on the south section line of Section 19, T1S, R8E, to the north-south centerline of Section 19, T1S, R8E; thence northerly on the north-south centerline to the east-west centerline of Section 19, T1S, R8E; thence east on the east-west centerline of Section 19, T1S, R8E, to Ridge Road; thence south on Ridge Road to the north edge of the M-14 expressway; thence east on the M-14 expressway to Beck Road; thence north on Beck Road to the north line of Plymouth Township.

R 317.182.10 Plymouth Township; hunting prohibited during certain portion of the year.

Rule 10. Hunting with, or the discharge of a firearm, is unlawful in Plymouth Township during the period March 1 to October 19 each year, except at target ranges recognized and approved by the Township Board.

Being a parent calls for sharing as well as caring

There's a woman out in California threatening to start a parent's liberation movement.

Elinor Lenz says society's erected too many barriers between the generations. "Now we need to make new connections," she insists.

Her idea is that parents have to develop new attitudes as their children mature into independent people.

"After all, does a 40-year-old man really need someone asking if he used his dental floss that day?" she asks. And must a grown woman be reminded that it's her grandmother's birthday?

Mrs. Lenz's thesis is that the parent-child relationship is based on unequal power. "The parent instructs and controls, and the offspring is expected to react to that," she contends.

"But a friend is not one with superior power. Friendship is based on mutual respect."

Mrs. Lenz told me all this in a recent interview. It must have been a comedown for her, because she had just been interviewed by Jane Pauley for the "Today Show."

She said she'd been told that appearing on that show is like "entering the gates of heaven." She also said Jane Pauley is beautiful and young-looking, face to face.

OUR CHAT was more like two experienced parents comparing notes. No heavenly gates, little glamour. Only she's got a thesis, and I do my parenting by the seat of my pants.

She's said if I don't make a transition soon to being an ex-parent, I'll be clinging to a dead relationship that's a stereotype. She'd like to see me develop a new loving connection with Tzvia, Elaine and Bruce and become an ex-parent.

Becoming an ex-parent would put me on the road to being a friend to my kids. Strange, but I always thought we were friends. At least lately.

We weren't always friends. I can remember wielding that power relationship stuff, all right. When the three rascals were finicky about eating, I'd always say: "I

didn't tell you to like it, I told you to eat it," and I'd say it with a snarl.

One of the kids once told that tale for show and tell, so I stopped doing it. But bedtime was always when Jack and I said it was.

Getting back to Mrs. Lenz, she has two daughters, whom she said are her best friends. "But it took time and struggle to get there," (Somehow, I understood what she meant by that.)

"YOU DON'T become a parent by having a child. There's more to it than biology. And the new role of being a friend to adult children is very important."

What you do is to disconnect yourself from your children. She said you have to listen to yourself and your child objectively.

"It's like divorced people who free each other for new relationships. Parents have to do the same," she said.

"You have to think of your child as someone who is an extension of yourself but who has a right to develop as a separate and unique individual — like a friend."

Mrs. Lenz has done a pile of research on the subject, including some with parents whose children have problems with drugs and cults.

"If parents can establish the friend relationship at the proper time, a lot of this wouldn't happen," she said.

"Those who join cults often are looking for companionship, for a family."

A longtime writer, who only lately has made a career of it, Mrs. Lenz has put her ideas and the results of research into a book called "Once my Child, Now my Friend" published by Warner Books. It's her third book, and she said it took years to form in her and one year to write.

One of the maxims of the parent's liberation movement that she may start and I may join, will be: "We have to learn to live with our children, not through them."

Take my advice

How to run a campaign

This is the season for political activity in the suburbs. Voters will soon be hearing a plethora of campaign statements, promises and praises. But the most interesting conversations won't be at the candidates night rallies in school auditoriums.

They will have taken place in the strategy meetings in the present-day versions of the smoke-filled back room.

We listened in recently as council candidate Bill Knight got some advice from Joe Swartz, the political pro who has been involved in more campaigns than Harold Stassen and Zolton Ferency combined.

Swartz to Knight: "Why do you want to be elected?"

Knight: Well, I'm very qualified. I've been involved in many civic programs in the last few years and I like working with city officials to contribute something positive to the community. I like helping people."

SWARTZ: "Plus you also like the idea of being a local big-shot, right?"

Knight: "Right."

Swartz: "Who are the other candidates?"

Knight: "Well, there's 10 candidates for four seats — nine men and one woman."

Swartz: "The first thing you got to do is get two more women candidates to split up the women's vote — it doesn't matter who they are, just get a couple of women to file. You better get a Polish candidate in there, too, to draw the Polish votes off, cause I don't think you're going to get them, you being a Protestant. Also make sure there are enough Catholics to go around."

Knight: "The way, I see it, I will run on a platform of honesty, integrity, efficiency, wise expenditure of citizen dollars and my background of civic accomplishment and business expertise."

SWARTZ: "Wrong. That's what everybody says. What are the issues?"

Knight: "Issues? I'm not sure."

Swartz: "What you'll do is talk about cutting down on crime in the suburbs before it gets out of hand — even though you won't be able to do anything about it — and you'll be for group homes as long as they are built down by the railroad tracks. It's too early to tell whether you will start attacking the present administration for wasteful, wanton extravagance."

Knight: "But I support the administration. I have the backing of the Mayor."

Swartz: "Don't tell anyone. It's not good to be cozy with the present administration until we are sure that they won't do something stupid between now and November. What you do is claim to be an independent thinker and doer who is skeptical of the way city funds are being spent. You'll want to talk about cutting out the fat — conventions and travel expenses, for example."

Knight: "But my supporters on the council won't want me to start talking about cutting out such things until I become accustomed to the budget."

SWARTZ: "Nothing. We'll send out a lot of mail and brochures with a lot of photos of you taken in front of the White House and we'll say only enough to make sure they look at the photos."

Now about money: My fee is high. How are you fixed?"

Knight: "I need money."

Swartz: "We'll have you a fund-raiser. The ideal fund-raiser is one where everybody kicks in and nobody shows up — keeps expenses down. We'll have a Tuesday morning breakfast at \$100 an egg and figure that nobody will want to come to the place I pick out."

"The way to do this, you see, is invite all the businessmen in town. You got to make them think that you'll do something for them after you're elected without ever really doing anything. At the same time you got to make them think you will probably win so they can't take the chance of crossing you now and paying for it later."

Knight: "That way I keep my integrity, right?"

Swartz: "Right."

Is a robot in your future?

Did you know that scientists have created a whole new generation of robots?

They will one day manage your household, cut your grass, tutor you in French, make a fourth in bridge and even psychoanalyze you.

By the end of the 20th century, scientists maintain, robot intelligence will surpass that of humans. The household robot need not be a clanking metal Jeeves with a whole body. He may be broken up and spread around the house.

Close your eyes and imagine you gave your flesh-and-blood cleaning woman her walking papers and rented an automaton who not only drives to work but manufactures cars.

Think about building a closet in which to store the robot's mini-computer brain. The brain operates on a network of mechanical arms that cook, wash dishes, make beds and give you a massage.

You'll have to decide what to call it. It'll be hard to decide if it's a Ms. or a his. You might settle on Sidney, which can go either way.

Just imagine mechanical arms shooting out and whipping up a crazy tin soufflé that Sidney serves with a can opener. After dinner, various parts of Sidney do the dishes, sweep the floor and mix cocktails.

You ask the robot to pull himself together and tell you the story of his life. In a voice created by intercommunication units, Sidney rasps, "I once worked on an assembly line making large cars for General Motors."

Schoolcraft presidency race narrows after trustee ballot

Grilling not over for candidates

The Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees culled its field of five semi-finalists for the college presidency to two Thursday in a one-ballot selection.

Chosen were Lyle Robertson, academic vice president at Macomb County Community College, and Richard McDowell, vice president for planning at the Community College of Allegheny County in suburban Pittsburgh.

The board agreed to create two, three-member subcommittees of

trustees augmented by two members of a citizen advisory board. Newly elected Laura Toy will be vacationing and is not expected to take part in the rest of the selection process.

The five-person groups will make personal visits to the campuses of Macomb and Allegheny this week, where they intend to interview various officials about the respective candidates.

Both Robertson and McDowell will also make their second visits to

the Schoolcraft campus, accompanied by their wives.

Trustees had good things to say about all of the five semi-finalists. But not surprisingly, they had better things to say regarding McDowell and Robertson — especially McDowell, who seemed to have infatuated the board. Three different trustees took pains to comment on his readiness for a college presidency.

ROBERTSON, Rosina Raymond

said, "has gone the entire range of education," pointing out that he's been a teacher at both high school and college levels as well as a college administrator.

Robertson, who was quiet-spoken in his interview with trustees, possesses "a very different type of leadership," Mrs. Raymond said, "but I don't think we should underestimate him."

"I guess some people don't come through an interview so well, but he speaks to public groups so I guess he

relates well," said Mrs. Raymond.

ON McDOWELL, Michael Burley said "his experience is excellent."

"Dr. McDowell seems to have all the experience and in addition to that comes across as a very dynamic person . . . I think he'd be a strong leader for any community college," added Burley.

Mrs. Raymond called McDowell "very self-confident," and added later that he has "respect and regard for all individuals . . . I think that's very important for an administrator."

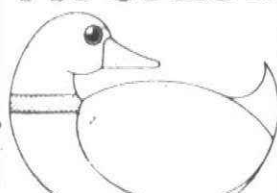
EMU summer enrollment off

Schoolcraft candidate eyes top post

Richard McDowell soon will be a community college president — if not at Schoolcraft, then at another quality institution.

"My career goal is to be a community college president. I'm committed to the community college. I'm holding out for a good one."

"You are a good one. You seem too good to be true," McDowell told the Schoolcraft board of trustees Wednesday as they interviewed him for the presidency.

A day later it turned out that McDowell, 44, has a 50-50 chance. He was one of two finalists gleaned from a field of five that Schoolcraft trustees had interviewed during the last two weeks.

And Schoolcraft trustees afterwards said no doubt McDowell will become a president, either of the northwest Wayne County two-year college or somewhere else.

In coming weeks, Schoolcraft will send a small delegation to visit McDowell's current place of work, the Community College of Allegheny County, Pa., where he is vice president for planning.

"I'll tell you who I am. If that's what you're looking for, then we have a match," he said.

"I'm a good administrator. I'm a people person. I'm good at one-on-one, in small groups and in people outreach. I'm good at planning, assigning

staff and following through.

"Our role is to train the labor force for business and industry," McDowell said. "Most companies have educational benefits. Most want you to do something for them."

"But they're never gonna ask you. It's a matter of getting out in the street and asking them. You don't know that unless you get out and knock on doors."

McDowell said he has set up a program for training supervisors at U.S. Steel; a lunchtime course one day a week at Westinghouse; a plant program for another firm; and an end-of-the-work-day class for still another.

While he was head of one of Allegheny's campuses, he said, adult education courses had 50 enrollees when he started, 8,000 when he left.



McDowell

A biologist by background, McDowell earned a bachelor's and two masters degrees from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and a PhD from Purdue University. He taught in secondary schools seven years before earning his

doctorate and has been in community college administration for 12 years in Pennsylvania's Beaver and Allegheny counties.

Great Lakes exhibit will make you beam

Lighthouse buffs may want to check out the Dossin Great Lakes Museum's exhibit honoring the 100th anniversary of U.S. Coast Guard activities on Belle Isle.

"Guardians of the Great Lakes" includes documents, models of Coast Guard vessels and relics from the early years.

The state Department of Natural Resources has contributed a display on Michigan's land and water facilities and a limited number of 18-by-21-inch full color brochures giving the history and locations of some 50 lighthouses around the state. Brochures will be distributed free while supplies last. It should be exactly the guide you need if you intend to make a slide collection or do water color paintings of Michigan lighthouses.

The Belle Isle lighthouse acted as a nautical guide on the Detroit River and Lake St. Clair from 1881 to the early 1940s. In 1942 the lighthouse was replaced by a modern lifeboat station for the Coast Guard's broader duties of law enforcement, logistics support, pollution control and checking lake levels.

The Dossin Museum, for those who have never been there, is located

ed on Strand Drive on the south side of the island facing Windsor. Signs will guide you.

Summertime...and the eating is easy, economical and delicious! Fresh produce is popping up all over in supermarkets and home gardens. And, easy-to-prepare eggs are as readily available, and when compared to other protein sources, as inexpensive as ever. When large eggs are \$1.00 a dozen, they're only 67¢ a pound! Put the two together and the result is sensational, but centsible, summer dining.

From asparagus to zucchini, the variety of vegetables available is more than sufficient to satisfy most anyone's taste buds. And, the variety of ways eggs can be prepared is almost unlimited. The recipes here include an elegant quiche, easy-to-make omelets, a speedy skillet supper scramble, a fast and flavorful frittata, and refreshingly light custards. But, you needn't stop there. Finely chop or shred your favorite vegetable and fold it into a soufflé. Roll up asparagus spears or broccoli stalks in crepes and ladle on a cheese sauce. Chop your veggies and toss them together with chopped hard-cooked eggs and either "mayo," sour cream or yogurt for a salad, sandwich spread or dip. For any meal of the day, there's an easy and economical way to get needed protein, vitamins and minerals on the table when you combine eggs with seasonal produce.

To keep you and your kitchen cool this summer, three of these recipes are top-of-range skillet suppers. The quiche can be baked either conventionally or in a microwave and you don't have to turn on the oven for the custards—they can be made in an electric skillet!

Try any or all of these recipes. Or, substitute other vegetables for those suggested. Either way, meal preparation will take so little time, you'll be able to get out and enjoy the summer sunshine.

ZUCCHINI TOMATO QUICHE

6 servings

Pretty as a picture and as tasty as it looks! Serve this impressive entree for a family breakfast, lunch or dinner or a stylish brunch for guests. Be sure to drain the tomato well as summer tomatoes are apt to be quite juicy.

| 1 (9-inch) baked pie shell* | 1 medium tomato, seeded, chopped and drained (about 3/4 cup) |
| 2 cups sliced zucchini (about 1 medium) | 6 eggs |
| 1/2 cup chopped onion | 1 cup half and half or milk |
| 1 tablespoon butter | 1/2 teaspoon oregano or basil leaves, crushed |
| 1/2 cup (2 oz.) shredded Swiss cheese | 1/2 teaspoon salt |
| 1 tablespoon flour | 1/8 teaspoon pepper |

In large skillet over medium heat, cook zucchini and onion in butter until lightly browned, about 5 minutes.

Sprinkle zucchini mixture, cheese, flour and tomato into pie shell. Beat together remaining ingredients until well blended. Pour over vegetables and cheese.

Bake in preheated 375°F. oven until knife inserted near center comes out clean, 30 to 35 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

*TO BAKE PIE SHELL

Line unbaked pie shell with 12-inch square of aluminum foil. Fill with rice or dried beans or peas. Cover rim of shell with edges of foil. Bake in preheated 450°F. oven until lightly browned at edges, 10 to 15 minutes. Lift out foil and rice. Cool on wire rack.

Microwave: Prick bottom and sides of pie shell with fork. Cook on High 4 to 4-1/2 minutes, rotating 1/4 turn after 1 minute and 3 minutes. Set aside.

In shallow casserole combine zucchini, onion and butter. Cover and cook on High until soft, about 4 minutes. Fill pie shell as above.

Cook on High 5 minutes, rotating 1/2 turn after 2-1/2 minutes. Reduce power to 50% or 30% and cook 11 to 15 minutes, rotating 1/4 turn two or three times to assure even cooking. Quiche is done when knife inserted halfway between center and outer edge comes out clean. Center will appear set but still slightly shaky. Let stand, uncovered, 10 minutes.

SWEET CORN OMELETS

4 servings

If you have only a couple of ears of corn and want to feed the whole family, or if you've got corn "coming out of your ears," try omelets. They're great any time of the day.

In medium saucepan, combine corn, green pepper, onion, water and 1/4 teaspoon of the salt. Bring to boiling. Cover, reduce heat and simmer until corn is tender, about 5 minutes. Keep warm while preparing omelets. Drain before filling omelets.

Mix eggs, water, remaining salt, mustard and pepper until blended. For each omelet, in 7-10-inch omelet pan or skillet, over medium-high heat, heat 1 tablespoon of the butter until just hot enough to sizzle a drop of water. Pour in 1/2 cup of the egg mixture. (Mixture should immediately set at edges.) With an inverted pancake turner, carefully push cooked portions at edges toward center so uncooked portions can reach hot pan surface, tilting pan and moving cooked portions as necessary. While top is still moist and creamy-looking*, place about 1/2 cup of the corn mixture on half of the omelet. Sprinkle 1/4 cup of the cheese over corn mixture. With pancake turner, fold omelet in half and invert onto plate with a quick flip of the wrist or slide from pan onto plate. Keep warm while preparing remaining omelets. Garnish with tomatoes and parsley, if desired.

*It is better to fill omelet when it is slightly underdone. Heat retained in eggs completes the cooking.

GREEN BEAN SCRAMBLE

4 servings

If you've never made a skillet scramble, the summer season is a wonderful time to try one. This recipe uses fresh green beans and Swiss cheese. Use another vegetable or a combination of several in place of the beans the next time you make one.

In medium saucepan, combine beans and water. Bring to boiling. Cover, reduce heat and simmer until beans are crisp-tender, 10 to 15 minutes. Drain and set aside.

Mix eggs, milk and seasonings until blended. In 10-inch omelet pan or skillet over medium heat, heat butter until just hot enough to sizzle a drop of water. Pour in egg mixture. Stir in reserved green beans and cheese. As mixture begins to set, gently draw an inverted pancake turner completely across the bottom and sides of pan, forming large soft curds. Continue until eggs are thickened but still moist.* Do not stir constantly.

*It is better to remove scrambled eggs from pan when they are slightly underdone. Heat retained in eggs completes the cooking.

EGGPLANT PARMESAN FRITTATA

4 servings

Eggplant lovers will rave. For eggplant haters, just change the name, keep that ingredient a secret, and they'll rave, too. The flavor is mild but rich. Also good cold.

In medium bowl beat together egg, water and salt. Add eggplant and toss gently until eggplant is completely coated with egg mixture. Let stand 10 minutes. Drain. Return eggplant to bowl, sprinkle with crumbs and toss until completely coated with crumbs.

In 10-inch omelet pan or skillet with ovenproof handle* over medium heat, cook eggplant in butter, stirring frequently, until lightly browned on all sides, about 5 minutes.

Beat together remaining ingredients except parsley. Pour over eggplant. Cook over low to medium heat until eggs are almost set, 12 to 15 minutes. Cover pan, remove from heat and let stand 8 to 10 minutes. OR, broil about 6 inches from heat until eggs are completely set, 4 to 5 minutes longer. Cut into wedges and serve from pan, or either slide from pan or invert onto serving platter. Garnish with parsley, if desired.

*To make handle ovenproof, wrap completely with aluminum foil.

CREAMY CUCUMBER CUSTARDS

6 servings

Cucumber in custards? Yes! Served warm or chilled, they make a refreshing meal starter, side dish or snack. Though light, they're luscious with cream cheese and sour cream adding richness.

Cut 6 thin cucumber slices. Set aside. Pare, seed and shred remaining cucumber. Stir in vinegar and salt. Let stand 15 minutes. Drain well, pressing out excess liquid. Set aside.

In small saucepan over medium heat, cook onion in butter until tender but not brown, 3 to 4 minutes. Stir in milk. Heat until very hot. Stir in cheese until melted. Remove from heat.

In large bowl, beat together remaining ingredients except watercress until well blended. Gradually stir in reserved cucumber and milk mixture. Place six (6 oz. each) custard cups in large baking pan. Pour egg mixture into custard cups. Place pan on rack in preheated 350°F. oven. Pour very hot water into pan to within 1-2 inch of top of custards. Bake until knife inserted near center comes out clean, about 20 to 25 minutes. Remove immediately from hot water. Serve warm or chilled. Garnish with reserved cucumber slices and watercress leaves, if desired.

To cook in electric skillet: Prepare egg mixture as above. Place filled custard cups in skillet. Fill skillet with very hot water to level of about 1 inch. Cover. Heat at 350°F. until water boils, about 4 to 5 minutes. Reduce heat and simmer until knife inserted near center comes out clean, about 10 to 15 minutes. Remove immediately from hot water. Serve as above.

Baking stones add old-world touch to breads

I'm sure that everyone has heard at some time that European peasant bread is quite different than breads produced in this country — either commercially or at home.

Part of the reason for this is that the basic ingredients used are different. The flour is ground from wheat which has been grown in different soils, yielding subtly different flavors. (Even the flour sold in this country varies from one region to another.) The strains of yeast are also different, resulting in varying degrees of sourness. Thus, even when identical techniques are used, the resultant loaves of bread will be distinct.

Another factor which affects the finished product is the oven used. Many Europeans do not bake their own bread since excellent commercially made loaves are readily available. These

loaves are baked in huge, brick-lined baker's ovens. These special ovens are said to contribute to the marvelous texture of European breads.

There must be a few of those ovens in this country but they are not readily available. Few of us have access to either European-quality bread or to a genuine brick baker's oven.

WHILE I HAVE no suggestions for remedying the former situation, short of making frequent jaunts to the Continent, there is a method of improvising a facsimile of the latter. Lining an oven rack with unglazed quarry tiles or with a baking stone creates a surface for bread-baking similar to that found in a brick oven.

Baking stones, either round or rectangular, are available in kitchen-supply shops. They are considered superior

to the quarry tiles but are also considerably more expensive. Quarry tiles — unglazed red squares used for floors — are available from any tile store and are refreshingly inexpensive. I paid 37 cents per six-inch square. Four squares should be sufficient but you may wish to use six for extra surface if your oven size permits.

The tiles should be set on an oven rack before the oven is turned on and allowed to preheat for at least 30 minutes before the bread is set on them.

Pizza also may be baked on the quarry tiles or baking stone. The advantage of this method over that of baking in a pizza pan is that the oils used in pre-

Worcestershire sauce for low sodium diets

Worcestershire sauce can be a valuable seasoning for low-sodium diets. The sauce contains only 55 mg of sodium per teaspoon. To put this in perspective, a teaspoon of salt contains 2,300 mg. of sodium and the same amount of soy sauce contains 365 mg. Also, as a seasoning, Worcestershire sauce is used in relatively small amounts. When its sodium contribution is figured on a per-portion basis, it becomes well suited to most low-sodium diets.

Cod with a Tang is marinated for extra savor in a Worcestershire-wine base for about an hour before baking. The Orange Chicken gets its tangy flavor from Worcestershire, orange juice and tarragon.

COD WITH A TANG
12 ounces fresh codfish fillets or steaks
1/2 cup red wine vinegar or fresh lemon juice
1/3 cup dry white wine
1 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
1/4 tsp. marjoram leaves, crushed
1/2 cup soft bread crumbs
Paprika

Place the fish in a snug-fitting shallow pan in a single layer. In a small bowl combine vinegar, wine, Worcestershire sauce and marjoram. Pour over fish; cover and set aside for 1 hour, turning fish after 30 minutes. Preheat

oven to 350 degrees. Drain off marinade reserving 2 1/2 tablespoons. In a small bowl combine bread crumbs and reserved marinade. Spoon on the fish; sprinkle with paprika. Bake until fish is almost cooked, about 12 minutes. Heat broiler to hot. Place baking pan under broiler until fish flakes when tested with a fork and bread crumbs are browned, about 1 minute.
Yield: 4 portions

ORANGE CHICKEN
3 lb. chicken parts
1/2 cup orange juice
1/4 cup vegetable oil
1 1/2 tsp. Worcestershire sauce

Prick chicken on all sides with fork tines; place in a shallow snug-fitting baking pan. In a measuring cup combine orange juice, oil, Worcestershire and tarragon. Pour over chicken; cover and set aside for an hour, turning chicken pieces over after 30 minutes. Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees. Bake chicken, skin side up, until tender, about 1 hour, basting with orange marinade occasionally.

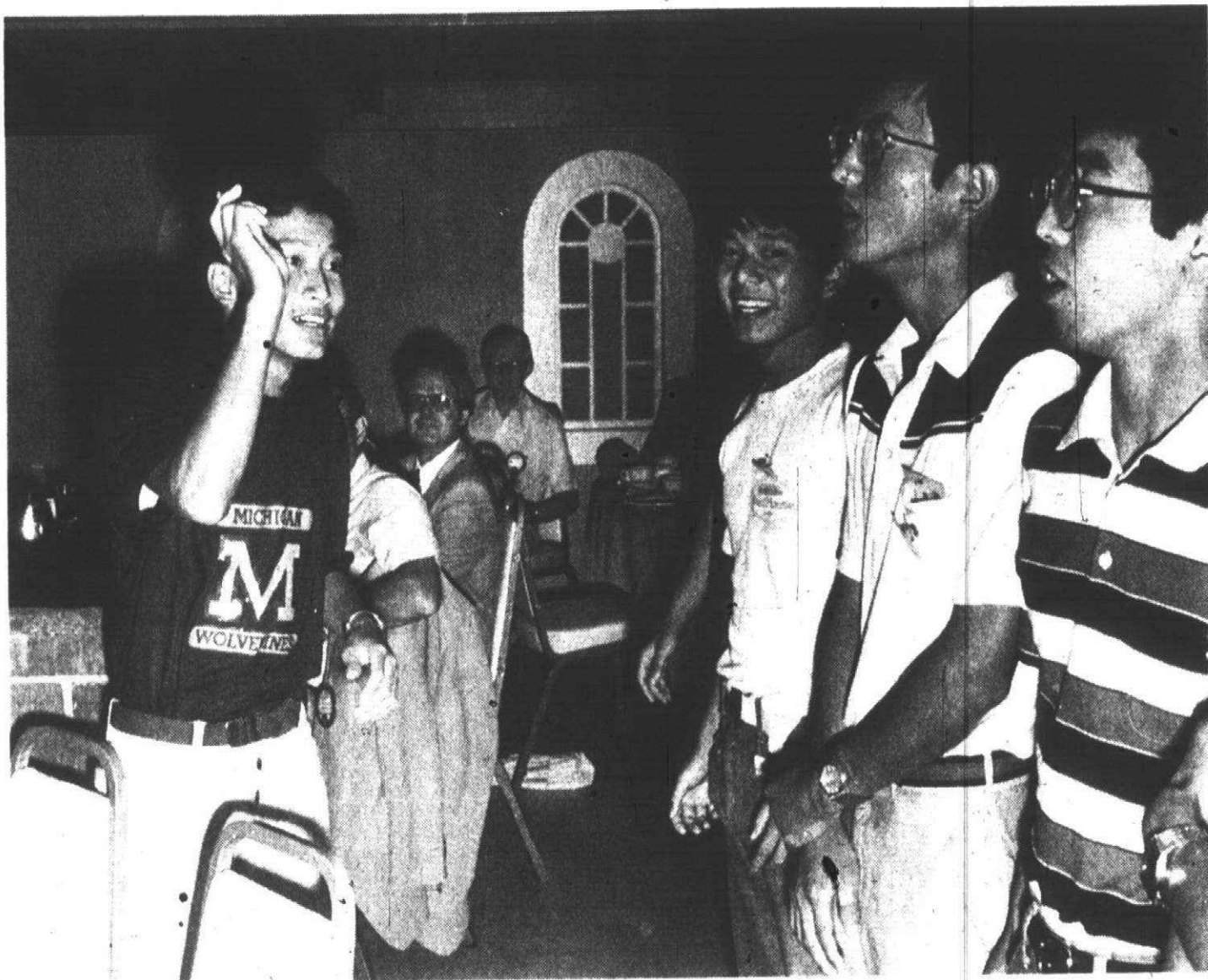
The donation of \$12 per player goes to the support of the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra — after expenses. Winners get their money back when the scores are tallied in early June.

Kiwanians play host to Japanese teenagers

Members of the Colonial Kiwanis Club of Plymouth invited 15 Japanese students and their chaperones to lunch Thursday for the club's regular luncheon meeting in the Mayflower Hotel. The teenagers didn't exactly sing for their luncheon, but they did serenade the Kiwanians.

They sang, "When the Saints Come Marching In" in four-part harmony in English. Then they sang a song in Japanese. They said the title could be translated as "Young Generation" and that it is very popular at home. It is available on tapes, cassettes and records and is often sung at sports days.

The meeting was an opportunity for the club members to meet the students whose Plymouth visit they had sponsored. A spokesman for the chaperones thanked the club for taking the students into their homes and sharing in the people-to-people exchange program.

Each of the Japanese students received a City of Plymouth T-shirt and a souvenir handbell. Later in the day, the students and their host families gathered at the home of Lois and Fred Andres in Canton Township for a picnic. It was the last social event in the area for them before they left for Shenandoah, Iowa, Friday morning.

HOSTING THE touring Japanese students has become an annual summer project for the Colonial Kiwanians.

The MBC High School Students Exchange Program was initiated 17 years ago by Suetaka Hatanaka, chairman of the board of the Minaminihon Broadcasting Company. Hatanaka said the idea of the program was derived from "the historical fact the Satsuma clan, inspired by the far advanced Western civilization at the time of the brief battle between the British Navy and the Satsuma clan in 1863, sent 15 bright young students to Europe and the United States for personal exposure to modern civilization. Upon their return to Japan, they served as the driving force behind the Meiji Restoration."

The students are from the Kagoshi-

ma Prefecture in Japan. Candidates for the program are nominated by their high school principals. Difficult written examinations and oral questioning narrow the number down to the chosen 15.

The group left Japan July 22 and arrived in Los Angeles the same day. The next morning they flew to Atlanta, Ga. and traveled from there to Athens for a five-day stay. Their flight to Georgia was the last plane trip for the students until they take off from San Francisco for home Aug. 18.

Hatanaka wants them to really see the country so they travel by bus. The students' families are from various economic levels. For those who cannot afford luggage and spending money, Hatanaka provides. MBC serves an area in which the number of radio and television sets is estimated at 3,181,000.

FROM ATHENS, the group went to Washington, D.C., New York City and Detroit before coming to Plymouth for their second home stay. They will have two more visits in American homes — in Shenandoah and in Santa Rosa Calif.

Lois and Fred Andres had four students:

Magumi Kanzaki, 17, is the daughter of a farmer and one of three children. Her hobbies are music appreciation and guitar. Itsuro Sakaguchi, 17, is the son of a high school teacher and one of three children. She likes to play tennis and also plays guitar. Shosaku Shigemaro, 16, son of a local government official and one of three children, said "Kendo" Japanese fencing is his favorite sport. Syusaka Hikari, 16, one of two children of a local government official also listed Kendo as his favorite sport.

Lois Andres said the students helped with the haying, pulled weeds and raked the yard in preparation for the picnic. Side trips took them to the Renaissance Center in Detroit, across the river to Windsor, Ontario, and to Ann Arbor, where they received University of Michigan T-shirts.

"They loved those T-shirts," said Mrs. Andres.

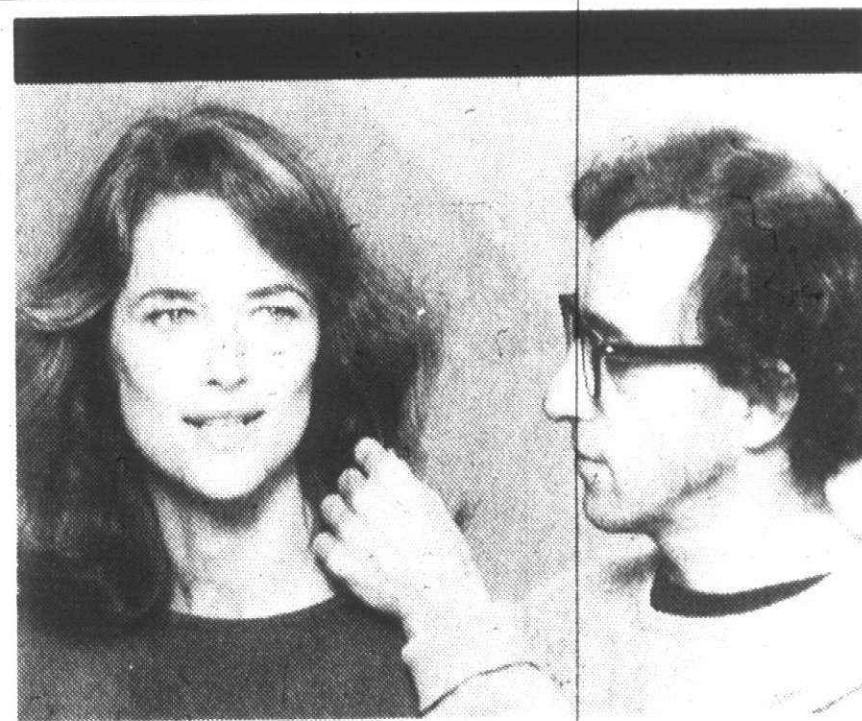
When they left Friday morning, there were tears of parting from both the boys and the parting from both the students and their hosts.

Heirloom holds up for 7 christenings

The little dress was fashioned with care back in 1907 by Adolphina Miastkowski, who came to this country from Poland and settled for a short time in Connecticut before she and her husband moved on to the Detroit area.

She made it for the christening of her firstborn son, Alexander. He was baptized in a Catholic church in New Britain.

And on July 26, the day that Alexander would have turned 74 if he were still living, Adolphina's great-great-grandson became the seventh baby to wear the christening gown.

Now 93 and still living with a daughter in the old family home on 32nd Street in Detroit, she wasn't able to attend the christening of Glenn Clark Obert, but she took a lively interest in the proceedings in St. Cyril Catholic Church of Taylor and remembered that "my Alexander would have been 74 today."

Glenn was born May 19. His mother, the former Rita Miastkowski, grew up in Westland and attended Franklin High School. She also was baptized in the heirloom dress.

ROSE CRUMM of Livonia, Rita's mother and Glenn's grandmother, told about the dress.

"It's made of crepe de chine and embroidered batista silk lace," she said, and Grandma made a little crepe de chine coat and hat to go with it.

"She had three children and they all wore it. Her son Edward is 72 now and lives in Canton, and her daughter Helen is 68 and lives with her mother in Detroit."

After Helen's christening, the dress was packed away for the next generation. Richard Miastkowski, Alexander's first son and Rita Obert's father, wore it in 1932 for his christening in St. Benedict Catholic Church of Detroit.

"My son Richard didn't get to wear it," Mrs. Crumm went on. "He was too big when he was christened. But Rita wore it in 1958. That was in the Hungarian Reform Church in Detroit."

JASON MIASTKOWSKI of Westland, Richard's son and Mrs. Crumm's grandson, led off his generation's use of the old gown when he was christened in April 1976 in St. Theodore Catholic Church of Westland. And baby Glenn brought the count to seven this month.

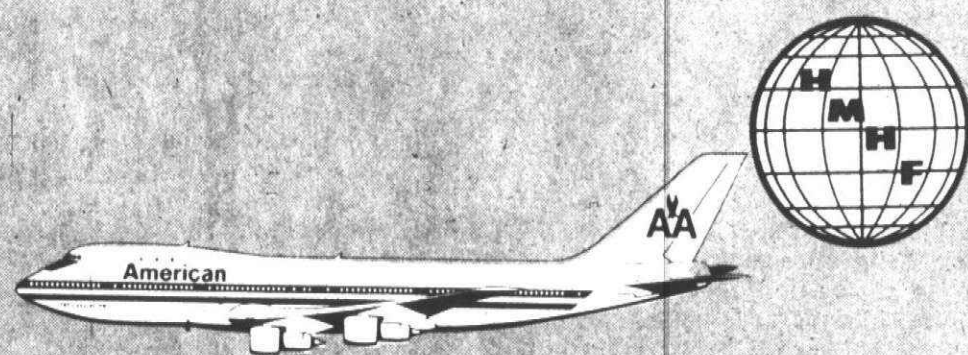

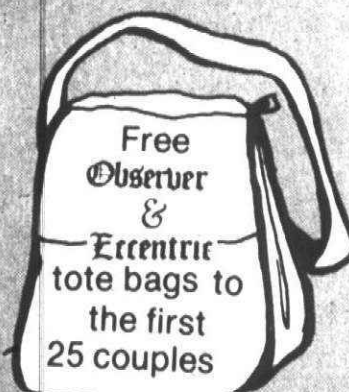

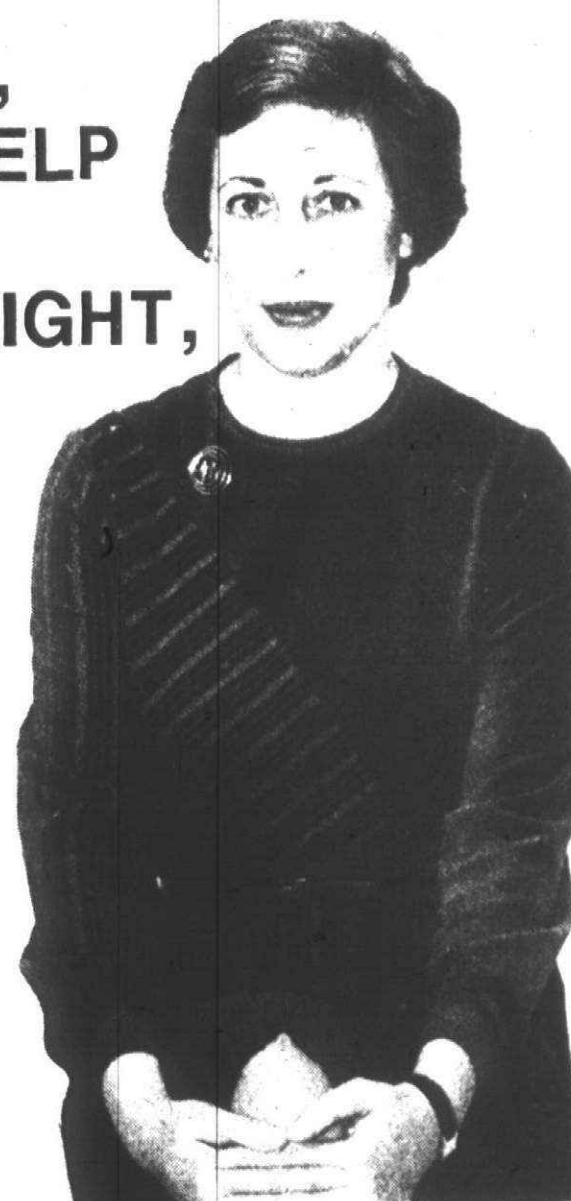

Hilltop grows; back 9 opened

Hilltop Golf Course was open for play Friday morning as an 18-hole facility and will remain open for the balance of the year.

Previously the golf course owned by Plymouth Township had been a nine-hole course and was expanded this past year to turn it into a money-making recreation facility.

The operators at Hilltop expect to add many more leagues next season as well as collecting the additional income from the higher fees which reflect the cost of playing the additional nine holes.

The fees are: \$4.50 for nine holes and \$6 for 18 on weekdays; \$5 and \$8.50 on weekends; \$2.50 for nine and \$3.50 for 18 for students; and \$3 and \$4 for senior citizens.

Electric carts will not be used for fear the new grass will be damaged, but pull carts will be available.

The renovated club house will include a pro shop, and bar with liquor, drinks and sandwiches offered.

Although exact figures aren't available yet, township officials estimate the total cost of the improvements will come close to \$1 million. Originally the township purchased

the nine-hole course for some \$383,000, and spent some \$250,000 for the raw land alone for the back nine holes.

Two years ago the township spent roughly \$220,000 in improvements and this year has invested about \$550,000.

Most of the money comes from income collected from year to year in the fund balance, with sizeable portions coming from state and federal revenue sharing monies.

The investment of large capital funds to expand Hilltop to an 18-hole course become a political issue, as some questioned the expenditure of such large sums of money for a facility which benefited only those persons who played golf.

A majority of the township board, however, has backed the expansion on the basis that the investment will make Hilltop a money-maker and will, in future years, return profits to the township coffers which can be used for other types of recreation.

As a nine-hole course, the township's income from Hilltop was an annual lease payment of \$6,000 from the manager. John Jawor is the current manager of Hilltop.

Craiger centerfielder Tom Moore started things off with a lead-off triple. Mike McKenney walked and Moore scored on a wild pitch.

Tim Michalik, the winning pitcher against Putty Hill for Canton, ripped a double which was followed by a two-run single off the bat of Matt Morrison.

Steve Sodbitch reached base on an error and after Mark Bennett singled, Dominic De Bello laid down a successful sacrifice bunt which scored Sodbitch.

Dave Briski drove in the final run of the inning with a single to left field.

Craiger didn't let up in the second inning. Hits by McKenney, Morrison and Mark Harbaugh were good for two more runs. Bennett knocked in Harbaugh to give Canton an insurmountable 9-0 lead.

"I was a little surprised at how well we hit the ball," said Ebmeyer. "With the quality pitching that is present in a tournament like this, I didn't think that we would score as many runs as that."

The offense wasn't the only thing going right for the host team, as Briski pitched an excellent game, faltering only once in his seven innings.

Briski looked shaky in the third inning when after a single, he loaded the bases with walks. Shortstop Chad Boling promptly emptied the bases with a long triple to close the gap to 9-3.

ATLANTA BEGAN to hit the ball hard after the third inning, but a good defensive play by Craiger catcher Morrison took the wind out of the south's sails.

Atlanta had stationed men at second and third base with no outs. Briski fanned second baseman Ken Penland and Morrison immediately fired the ball to third base and caught Ed Gattorno leaning for a double play. Atlanta remained hitless for the last 3½ innings.

"Briski did a nice job," said Ebmeyer of his winning pitcher. "And Morrison has made a big difference. He has really helped us out in this tournament. I just hope that our pitching holds out like it has."

In the tournament opener, Bennett was knocked from the mound by the strong hitting of Putty Hill Optimist.

Bennett lasted only 1½ innings as Baltimore scored a run in the first inning and three more in the second before Michalik was called to the mound.

Michalik finished the game, which lasted nine innings, in grand style. He allowed two runs on only two hits and struck out four, but it was the Craiger bats that put the finishing touches on its opponent.

TRAILING BY two runs, 6-4, in the bottom of the seventh, Briski led off with a single. Moore, who finished the game with four hits, ripped another single. Both runners advanced a base on a throwing error. A solid single by Sodbitch scored the tying runs.

Neither team was able to mount a scoring threat in the eighth, but in the ninth inning, De Bello led off with a walk and Moore dropped a picture perfect bunt single to put a runner in scoring position.

An intentional walk loaded the bases, and with both the outfield and infield moved in for a play at the plate, Sodbitch, who had tied the game in the seventh, won it in the ninth with a long single that flew over the leftfielder's head to score De Bello from third.

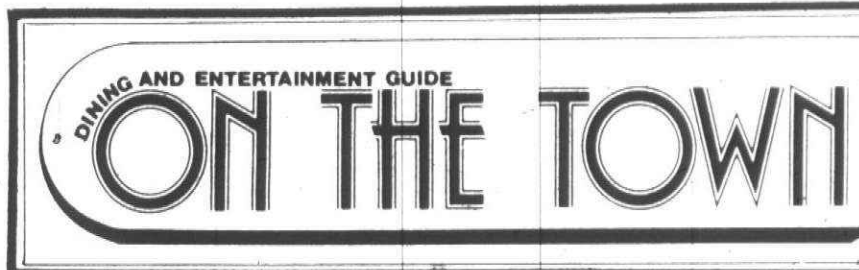

Suspense charges German-spy tale 'Eye of the Needle'

If there are any movie-goers not glued to their seats and hanging on every development in "Eye of the Needle" (R), it's only because they already have read the book and know each turn of events.

Even so, there is fresh pleasure in store because the movie version of Ken Follett's best-selling novel is a solidly crafted, splendidly acted spy adventure.

Directed by Richard Marquand and adapted from Follett's novel by Stanley Mann, the movie simplifies and condenses the twists and subplots of the novel without losing any dramatic punch.

The one simplification that doesn't work well is the superficial treatment of the British operatives who are tracking the German spy. They are not defined as sharply as other characters.

THIS TENDS to lessen their involvement and, with it, the sense of relentless pursuit. However, judicious editing establishes a rapid progression of events that helps compensate for this deficiency.

Donald Sutherland is Henry Faber, the brutally efficient German spy planted in England. He is known as The Needle because of his method of killing with a stiletto.

The year is 1944, and rumors are rife about an allied invasion of Europe. The German intelligence command, seeking positive information on the allied troop build-up and the likely location of the invasion, turns to The Needle.

When Faber obtains the sought-after information, he sets out in a small ship to rendezvous with a German U-boat off the British coast. Before he can reach the U-boat, he is caught in a terrible storm and shipwrecked on a small island whose only inhabitants are a young woman, her crippled husband, their small son and an old man who helps them tend their flock of sheep.

Once the action shifts to the island, the drama and suspense intensify through the interplay of human emotions. Faber is the mysterious stranger who enters the family's secluded world and triggers a violent chain of events.

SUTHERLAND IS masterful as Faber. He makes the spy a fascinating character by developing him with the same degree of thought and attention he might give to portraying a Shakespearean character.

Christopher Cazenove is the husband. A former fighter pilot, he was crippled in an auto accident and hasn't been able to reconcile himself to his handicap. He keeps his wife at a distance by his continual bitterness and outbursts of anger.

Kate Nelligan is outstanding as the forcibly estranged wife. She is a beautiful woman who combines upper-class manners with a smoldering sensuality. She makes the sudden sexual relationship with Faber understandable and convincing.

This is essential to subsequent developments and leads to an exciting climax in which Faber's passionate devotion to duty is challenged by his passionate devotion to a lonely woman.

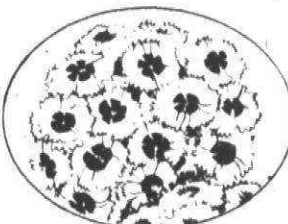

DOES PREGNANCY CAUSE TOOTH DECAY?

Once and for all, let's put the myth to rest. Pregnancy does NOT cause tooth decay. It is easy to see where certain factors may lead to this erroneous conclusion. During pregnancy, women tend to be busier preparing for the upcoming birth. Once the baby arrives, she is even busier. Instead of six months, it may be a year or more between visits. Obviously, more dental work will be discovered in a period of one or two years than in a six-month checkup.

Of course, women experience certain hormonal changes during pregnancy. These changes may produce a temporary condition of puffiness or bleeding of the gums. This condition is called "pregnancy gingivitis" and can be controlled by keeping the mouth "preventive clean" by the proper use of brushing and floss.

Equally false is the notion that baby robs the mother's teeth of calcium. The composition of adult teeth cannot be changed once fully formed. Babies may be responsible for stretch marks — but not dental decay.

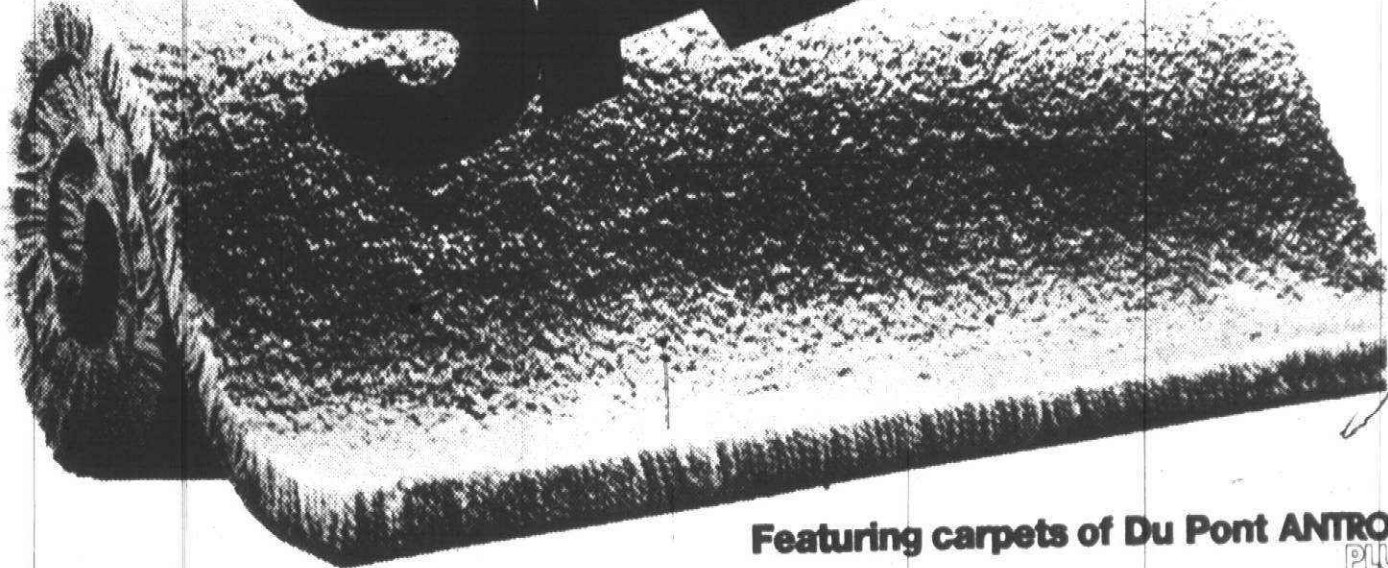

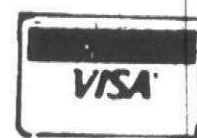

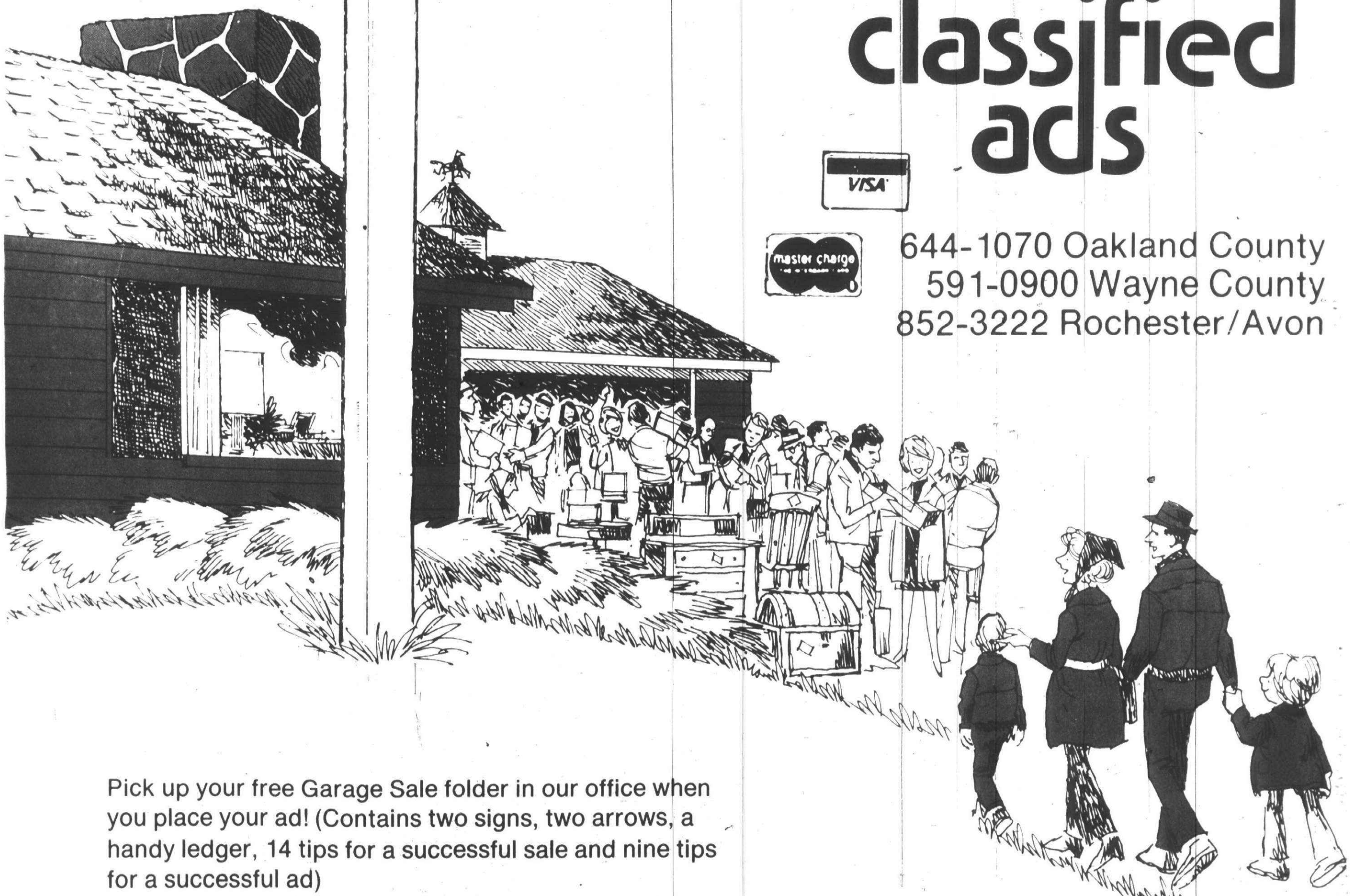

Proper use of garden hose will help car live longer

It's easier to take care of your car while enjoying the warm weather of summer. Take this opportunity to bring out the garden hose to lengthen the life of your car, says the Automotive Information Council.

You may have shined up the exterior of the car, but chances are you might have forgotten about the under-fender areas, where moisture-laden road salt and/or mud cling to develop a breeding ground for rust.

If left there, the debris can begin to eat away at the metal surfaces, despite the increased use of galvanized metals, zinc coatings, plastic inner liners and improved sealants.

That's where the garden hose comes in. Turn the nozzle on full force and saturate the under areas of the car.

Then use an old broom or brush to loosen up

and remove the grime. Spray again to rinse away the residue.

ANOTHER BRUSHING and spray might be required if the buildup is heavy.

It's a messy job, but will be worthwhile in keeping a way rust.

Some automatic car washes have installed power washes to clean these under areas so if you have one nearby you can avoid the garden hose/brush routine, but however you do it get rid of the salt, silt and sand.

At the same time, a car owner might consider cleaning a grease-coated engine by applying a solvent available at auto parts stores. The garden hose then is used to rinse away the cleaner.

Then, of course, you'll have to finish the job by cleaning the driveway.
