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Schools say no to reopening farm

The School Farm will remain in mothballs.

Monday night the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education rejected an offer from the Rotary Club of Plymouth to take responsibility to operate the farm during the coming school year.

The school board voted 5-2, with Trustees Tom Yack and Elaine Kirchgatter dissenting, to accept the administration's recommendation for budgetary reasons.

The cabinet discussed the Rotary proposal Monday morning and felt there were hidden costs that would fall on the district to cover.

The cabinet, and some board members, also felt the farm should not be re-opened unless a full program could be run on a long-term basis.

Some administrators and trustees felt the Rotary proposal was hastily put together and was lacking in long-term commitment.

IN A REPORT to the school board, Superintendent John M. Hoben wrote that the cabinet was recommending denial of the Rotary proposal because of:

"... hidden costs in operation (such as transportation, maintenance and supervision) for which no budgetary consideration has been given. All of these items are not addressed in the Rotary communication and would, in some measure, fall upon the district for funding."

Rotary had offered to cover maintenance and repair costs "up to \$50 on each occurrence" but the cabinet felt that operating the farm on a normal basis would require maintenance costs well beyond the \$50 limit.

Hoben added that busing children from school buildings to the farm and back was not budgeted by the district and not covered in the Rotary proposal.

The superintendent also felt additional supervision, beyond that provided by the tenant, would be needed and would fall upon the school district to finance.

Rotarians had proposed to find a tenant to live in the farm building for \$100 a month rent plus utilities with the tenant

responsible for general upkeep of the grounds and for care of the animals.

Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business, said he talked with a realtor who claims the farm house can be rented for \$400 to \$450 per month plus utilities. Hoedel told the board Monday night if the Rotary proposal were rejected, the district would proceed with plans to rent out the farm house for security reasons.

"With such a hastily conceived proposal and without answers to these concerns," Hoben said, "we feel that the board should direct the administration to immediately advertise for a tenant — one who would be responsible for the security and general maintenance of the area in exchange for a fair and equitable amount of rent."

"It is also the cabinet's feeling that we have mothballed the existing equipment and have shut the farm down; and, until we are in a position where we can effectively run it on a long-term basis, it should remain mothballed. The Rotary proposition is for a very limited time period, on a yearly basis."

"We all agree that the farm is a worthwhile educational opportunity and a function that we would dearly love to have. However, we also are aware that most of the cost projections on the revenue side are coming in on a shortfall basis, as reflected by the most recent year-end fund equity."

Hoben was referring to a recent communication from the district's auditors that fund equity at year's end would be about \$150,000 less than budgeted.

KENNETH HULSING, spokesman for Rotary, remarked that the club originally had invested \$20,000 as seed money to get the farm started and still was interested in the farm as a community service the club would like to provide.

Glenn Schroeder said he was grateful for Rotary's past and continued support of the school district and community but that all of the arrangements the club had proposed it would make with the tenant could also be made by the district itself.

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Country festival draws big crowd

The sixth annual Canton Country Festival now is history, but fond memories of this event will stay with everyone who visited Griffin Park last weekend.

The festival ended late Sunday night after a record 1,700 dinners were sold at the six-hour Canton Chamber of Commerce Chicken Barbecue.

"We were pleased with the way everything went," said Flossie Tonda, president of the festival board. "There was a little rain on Saturday, but that didn't hurt anybody."

The overwhelming turnout at the sixth annual chicken dinner surprised many festival officials.

"Next year we are going to have to have two barbecue pits," Mrs. Tonda said. "We just couldn't handle all the requests for dinners on one pit."

Mrs. Tonda added that the 1,700 dinners sold were "500 or 600 more than we had last year."

Canton's parade on Saturday included more than 85 entrants, including the famed Moslem Shriners group of Lancers (little cars), oriental band (Mideast music) and Ameri-

cans (cowboys and indians). The parade was more than 1½ miles long.

John Schwartz, president of the Canton Chamber of Commerce and festival board member, estimated that 12,000-15,000 people attended the festival activities at Griffin Park during the three-day event.

He added that "about 10,000-15,000 people" attended the parade.

Last year, 5,000-7,000 attended the fifth annual festival.

"We accomplished what we wanted — to get the people of Canton together. We're talking about community spirit."

"We were swamped Sunday afternoon. We had to open up another area for parking."

Schwartz estimated that 700 pancake breakfasts were sold by the Canton Rotary Saturday morning. The Canton Jaycees sold 400 steak dinners Friday night, and the fire department's Saturday night spaghetti dinner attracted 325 people, according to Schwartz.

Landfill issue is murky; township concerned

To dump or not to dump, that is the question.

And the issue gets more "hazardous" each day.

Michigan Waste Systems wants to expand on its existing landfill, Woodland Meadows North, and has applied for permission to operate a solid-waste disposal on the expanded site, called Woodland Meadows South, in southeast Canton. Indications are that the company also will apply for a hazardous-waste permit on the expanded site. Deadline for application is tomorrow.

Currently, the state Department of Natural Resources and the Wayne County Health Department are review-

ing the expansion request for the solid-waste permit.

Residents in the Canton, Wayne and Van Buren Township are angry about the proposed expansion. They expressed their feelings at a public hearing two weeks ago and, again, at Monday night's Canton Planning Commission meeting. They are upset with the operation of the current landfill site and don't want to see expansion of any kind.

Some residents also are angry because they claim township officials lost a petition signed by 4,000 residents against landfill areas and hazardous waste sites.

Township officials admit to misplacing the petition, which was brought to Township Hall 1½ years ago, and say

they understand the concerns of residents on this issue.

Township officials also are leaning toward denying the expansion request by Michigan Waste Systems.

"CERTAINLY, IF a vote was taken today, I don't think it would be approved, but there's still room for negotiation," said James Kosteva, Canton's township planner. Kosteva added he felt the township had "special-approval authority" on the use of the proposed expanded area — a 105-acre site bounded by Hannan, Lotz and Van Born roads and the Conrail railroad right of way adjacent to the 97-acre North site.

Kosteva said Monday's commission meeting included discussion on the expansion proposal and input from resi-

dents who were against the request.

The planning commission wants to discuss the issue further with Waste Management Systems at the Monday, Aug. 24, meeting, Kosteva said. The commission may make a recommendation to the township board on this issue at that meeting, Kosteva added.

MEANWHILE, RAY Kellas, district manager for Michigan Waste Systems and general manager of the Woodland Meadows site, said it was "still premature," but his company "probably" will apply for a hazardous-waste permit on the South site. Kellas added his company is prepared to wait for a decision from both the DNR and the township on the expansion issue.

A recommendation from the town-

ship board on the solid-waste expansion site could come as late as mid-October.

Separate public hearings and further investigations, conducted by the DNR and the township, still must take place, if Michigan Waste Systems applies for a hazardous-waste permit as well. Recommendation on this permit may come as late as the end of the year.

PETITIONS WITH 4,000 signatures from angry residents against landfill operations were brought to Township Hall 1½ years ago, but were lost, Kosteva said.

"The fact of the matter is that we can't find the petitions," Kosteva admitted. "They've been lost in Township Hall."

"But my opinion is that it's not important where the petitions are but that

we know that 4,000 people object to landfill areas."

"That's what's remembered." One resident who contacted the Observer about the missing petitions but refused to give his name didn't say why the missing petitions were important to area residents.

The township gave initial indications that it opposed the expansion site at a public hearing conducted by the DNR two weeks ago.

DAVID NICHOLSON, Canton's assistant planner, said, in a prepared statement, that the township recognized the need for waste-disposal sites and credited Michigan Waste Systems with its current operation at Woodland Meadows North.

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Roman Forum sponsors lamb

Under the program, the sponsor, in this case the Roman Forum, purchases food for the animal from a young farm boy who is feeding it, and then will attempt to gain possession of the animal by outbidding everyone at the auction.

"It is a good thing to help young people," Greg Gatto, owner and manager of the Roman Forum, said. "And we will do all we can to help."

While revealing the Forum's part in the program, Gatto smiled and said, "If the boy wants to keep the lamb here, we have plenty of grass out in back of the building. The little lamb can have all of it."

INFORMED THAT, according to the children's verse, written years ago, that Mary and her lamb were always together, Gatto quickly answered: "She is welcome, too."

The lamb, now 7 months old, is being raised by Jeff Ehrhart, the same boy who is raising a steer sponsored by the Mayflower Hotel in Plymouth.

The Roman Forum paid the \$80 fee for the feed that will bring the animal on to the auction block weighing about 110 pounds.

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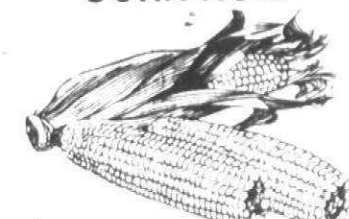


Jeff Ehrhart, 11, pets his lamb, sponsored by the Roman Forum in Canton.

But Nicholson added the township was worried about the compatibility of the expansion with existing township zoning ordinances. The land adjacent to the expansion site is intended for general industrial use.

There are some striking dissimilarities between the two sites," Nicholson said in his statement. "Whereas the existing landfill operation is substantially isolated from residential

property, the proposed development would be within a few hundred feet of residentially zoned land."

Woodland Meadows landfill was developed in 1975. It is one of four landfills in Michigan operated by Michigan Waste Systems.

Less than 5 percent of the waste disposed in Woodland Meadows North is hazardous, according to Michigan Waste Systems.

Time to walk

Schools eliminate some bus routes

During the next two weeks some parents will be receiving notices that their children will not be bused to school this fall.

Some 1,000 students who were bused to school this past year for "safety reasons" will be walking to school when classes resume Sept. 2.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education Monday night approved the elimination of a number of safety busing trips as recommended by the safety committee.

The safety committee hopes to eliminate all safety busing within three years and is proceeding toward that goal with elimination of busing for some 1,000 students at all levels.

One of the major steps will be to require all high school students living within 1.5 miles of school to walk. This involves some 90 students who last year were bused to the Centennial Educational Park.

Safety busing occurs when the school board allows students who living within 1.5 miles of school to be bused because of the existence of hazardous areas enroute to school.

Dale Goby, director of transportation, says that criteria used to determine safety busing includes: grade level and age of students; adequacy of safe walking area; traffic conditions; bad weather conditions; and time of day.

In past years safety busing was provided for some subdivisions in the townships because of the lack of sidewalks, but this standard won't be applied this year.

"Overall, the committee felt that the main reason safety busing needed to exist at all was because the local units of government had shirked their responsibility for providing sidewalks throughout the school district," noted Goby.

"The committee saw numerous examples of sidewalks installed in subdivisions but not installed along the major roadways connecting subdivisions to schools.

"Examples of this lack of government cooperation was especially prevalent in Plymouth Township and Canton Township."

One of the first determinations the committee made, stressed Goby, was that a "safe walking area" did not depend on a paved surface. Thus the lack of sidewalks was not a criteria for busing students.

It was pointed out during the meeting Monday

that for some older students the safe walking area will be the shoulder of the road.

By policy, all students who live more than 1.5 miles from school are bused and all students in grades K-2 who live one mile or more from school will be bused.

The school board voted that students who have to cross Lilley to get to Field and Eriksson elementaries will walk to school unless traffic studies indicate crossing Lilley with the aid of a crossing guard would be unsafe.

The safety committee had recommended elimination of safety-busing for students in Woodlore subdivision attending Pioneer Middle. This area is south of Ann Arbor Road. The board, however, voted to allow safety busing to continue for these students because they would have to walk along Ann Arbor Road.

Goby stressed he didn't feel the safety of any students would be compromised by the elimination of safety busing.

The changes, though, will reduce the number of students bused and will remove some of the cost charged the district for busing students who live within 1.5 miles of school.

For each student bused who lives within 1.5 miles, the district loses \$24.31 in state reimbursement. The elimination of safety busing recommended will save some \$25,500 in lost reimbursements.

Goby said notices will be sent this week and next to parents whose children are affected. Because the school board expects appeals, the safety committee was asked to attend the next regular meeting of the school board on Aug. 24.

For Eriksson and Field schools, Canton Township Police are conducting a gap study to determine whether it is safe for children to cross Lilley with the help of a crossing guard.

Trustee Tom Yack noted that sidewalks are financed by special assessments and are not dependent upon either township paying for them out of general fund monies. The townships can build walks and assess residents or the walks can be requested by petition and financed through special assessments, he added.

Schroeder said the board should wait until it gets a report from its farm committee for the 1982-83 year before accepting a proposal from the outside.

Mrs. Kirchgatter argued that field trips would be financed with money in the block grants of individual schools or would be handled by parents. She noted that school buses this past year were not used to transport students to the garden plots on the farm but instead parents provided the transportation.

If a teacher decided students should have exposure to a farm and took a field trip to a facility such as Upland Hills Farm, she added, the expense would be greater than a trip to the school farm. She maintained transportation was not an added hidden cost.

Hoben answered that field trips have not been eliminated but the block grant allocations have been so sharply cut that they mostly would be spent on supplies and texts, not on field trips.

Trustee Flossie Tonda noted that the farm committee recommended mothballing, in part, because only 2,000 students of a total enrollment of 16,000 had visited the farm and many of the 2,000 were returnees.

"It was felt until we could change the farm into a learning laboratory for all children that it would be better to mothball the farm rather than throwing good money after bad," added Mrs. Tonda. (Last year the district budgeted some \$43,000 for the farm, including salary of the resident-manager.)

The Rotary proposal did not provide for anything new which has not been provided at the farm for the past 10 years, said Mrs. Tonda, and that program has not been successful. "We need a commitment from the teachers to take the kids there and, so far, we haven't had that."

Safety committee members include: Goby, Dan Minghine, director of building and grounds; Walter Bartnick, labor relations director; Earl Gibson, Harold Weiner, and Dave Dursum, school administrators; Johnie Belcher, a crossing guard; and residents Jeanette Wines, Marilyn Rickard and Camille Van Kirk.

Schools which had the largest reductions in safety busing included Smith, Allen, Hulsing, Ericksson, Field, and Gallimore.

Trustee Sylvia Stetz commented that the district did not have a good policy governing sponsorship of school activities by private groups and should not accept the Rotary proposal until such a policy was devised. With school funds becoming so tight, she added, such cooperative arrangements may become more common in the future.

Hulsing suggested that the main issue was whether or not the district wanted a school farm. He added that Rotary had a long-standing record in and would stand-by its projects on a continuing basis if operating the farm proved feasible.

"We are new at this and suggested the one-year agreement. But if it works, we'll support it for a long term."

"Rotary's proposal to run the school farm gives children a chance to look at animals," noted Yack. "The issue of instruction should be totally separate because it's not provided now."

"The question is do we want to take what's available and offer it to students with someone else's energy and money or do we want to leave it on a non-functioning basis?"

Yack stressed the district was stuck with certain costs of maintenance and security because it owned the farm and will bear those expenses whether or not Rotary's proposal was accepted.

Trustee Bill Decker suggested Rotary work with the ad hoc save the farm committee and other community groups to help open the farm for the '82-'83 year.

Hoben noted that the \$20,000 seed money provided by Rotary over five years was matched by the school district and since then the district has spent three times that amount.

Area a leading maker of boxes

Without any fanfare or blustering, the packaging industry has become a leading manufacturing activity in the Plymouth community.

There are seven firms engaged in some part of the business and chances are that the refrigerator you purchased or the gift you bought for a friend came in a package or box that was made in Plymouth.

Leading in the activity are two companies — Crown Zellerbach, on General Drive and Packaging Corp. of America on Sheldon Road.

The other five are concerned more with assembling boxes for use with pallets to deliver goods. And still another, Linco Packaging on Goldsmith, deals with the smaller orders that are frowned upon by the larger companies.

Seated in the midst of piles of corrugated paper, Ken Wood, the owner of Linco, smilingly confessed that "we get what the others don't want and no order is too small. We take them as they come."

It is a different story at Crown Zellerbach where John Delaney, the resident manager, proudly stated that his company manufactures 20 million boxes each year.

"They come in all sizes, and we will provide boxes as small as 4x4 or as large as 40x40. But we do get them out of here in great numbers."

The Packaging Corp. of America is considered one of the most modern packaging firms in the business. The plant was rebuilt following the great fire in 1972 and it is now automated, even to manufacturing its own paper.

The automation has helped reduce the work force and the firm now averages 60 employees on two shifts, not including the office staff.

While no count was made of the boxes manufactured at the Sheldon Road plant, it was stated that somewhere in the neighborhood of 380 million square feet of corrugated paper was used each year.

With a third shift, if the economy improves, the figures would go much higher.

Another of the busy places is the Northland Container Corp. on General Drive. This is a warehouse for the big

dealers and there was no idea of how many boxes are assembled or stored there. "It all depends on the economy," one of the spokesmen stated.

The L&W Container firm on Eckles Road specializes in boxes that are attached to pallets for delivery of smaller boxes, and it was stated that the business is showing some improvement with the change in the economy.

The Parco Industries and Troy firm, both on Mill Street, take part in all sections of the activity. The Troy firm, recently purchased by a Grand Rapids concern, is expected to take a leap upward because the new owners have corrugators that will fill the gap that was missing at Troy for years.

While Detroit boasts many packaging houses, Plymouth and Melvindale are considered the top two in the southeastern Michigan suburbs.

And while Little has said about it, the packaging business now has taken the place of the Daisy Air Rifle firm that once hearded the name of Plymouth around the country.

TAG numbers reach thousand

An unprecedented number of students were nominated for the talented and gifted (TAG) program of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools in recent months.

Nearly 1,000 students were nominated during March, April and May and now are being considered.

"We were obviously pleased with the number of nominations," says Cheryl Johnson, coordinator of the program.

"We also were overwhelmed with the screening process these nominations required. We expect that parents of all students in the academically talented program will be notified of their child's placement sometime early in the fall.

"We appreciate the patience parents have shown in awaiting the placement results."

Screening results will be sent to all parents early in the fall, she added.

The academically talented program is designed to provide a challenge to youngsters in the district who have superior academic

School starting times changed

New school starting times have been set for this fall to minimize the number of bus routes needed to transport students.

The major changes will be at the middle school level which this year will have a staggered start.

The result will be that the school day will be from 7:40 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at West and Lowell middle schools while the hours will be 8 a.m. to 2:50 p.m. for East, Central and Pioneer middle schools.

The hours at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) will remain the same, from 7:15 a.m. to 2:05 p.m.

A number of changes, mostly involving shifts of five minutes, have been made at the elementary level.

Dale Goby, director of transportation, reported to the school board Monday night that double-

loading has been eliminated at the CEP, East and Pioneer middle schools.

The new starting times, Goby stressed, will reduce the number of routes from 77 in 1981-82 to 51 this coming year and will allow the district to get by with four fewer buses.

If the double loads had continued and starting times remained unchanged, Goby added, the district would have needed 12 additional buses this fall.

Many of the schedule changes were made because of the shift of ninth-graders from the CEP to the middle school level, he explained.

There still are some problems to be worked out with the new starting and closing times, noted Superintendent Dr. John M. Hoben.

"This is especially true as it relates to staff members who work at two different buildings, particularly for language teachers who will be

serving the high school and middle school levels this coming year.

Goby explained that West and Lowell were assigned the earlier starting times because most of their routes are shorter than for East, Central and Pioneer.

Goby added that the district will get by with fewer buses for the summer of 1982 because of Pioneer Middle going off the Extended School Year (ESY) year-round schedule.

The starting time changes at the elementary level are: Allen, from 9 a.m. to 8:55; Bird, from 8:45 to 8:40; Farrand, from 8:45 to 9:05 a.m.; Gallimore, from 9 to 9:05; Geer, will remain at 8:35 a.m.; Smith, from 8:40 to 8:45; Starkweather, from 8:45 to 8:55; Tanger, from 9 to 9:05 a.m.; Fiegel, from 8:45 to 8:55; Isbister, from 8:45 to 8:50; Miller, from 9 to 9:05 a.m.; Hulsing, from 9 to 9:05; Eriksson from 8:45 to 8:50; and Field, from 9 to 9:05 a.m.

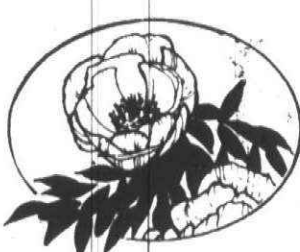

Power: Press freedom 'at risk'

"The future of press freedom around the world is at risk," said Philip H. Power, chairman of Suburban Communications Corp., in a speech at Oakland Community College. Suburban Communications is the parent company of the 12 Observer & Eccentric Newspapers.

Appearing Aug. 5 as a Community Continuum speaker on the Orchard Ridge Campus, Power said many less-developed countries have allied themselves with the Russians to try to use UNESCO as a way of attacking western press freedoms.

"Such an attack is not easy to defend," Power said. "Many third-world countries have legitimate gripes at American news reporting. They think it is sensationalistic, inaccurate and pays no attention to local conditions."

"THE RUSSIANS, of course, hate any kind of free press. And UNESCO, as a specialized agency within the United Nations system, does not give the U.S. a veto; in effect, we are in a permanent minority," Power said.

"It would be like somebody from Wayne County

walking into the office of the Farmington Observer to tell the editor he could not run a story if UNESCO was able to do the thing it wants," Power said.

Power has been a special consultant to the U.S. Department of State on world press freedom issues for four years and has attended many international meetings on the subject, including one this spring at Talloires, France, at which he served on the drafting committee for the Declaration of Talloires.

"The Talloires meeting, which was attended

by 75 journalists from 24 countries, concluded that press and news freedoms were basic human rights," Power said.

"The declaration has now been widely distributed. It has been endorsed by the U.S. Congress. It is making the Russians see red, and UNESCO is reacting with alarm as this is the first time representatives of the free press have taken the offensive."

UNESCO HAS been promoting a group of ideas clumped under the title of the "New World Information Order," Power explained.

In this program would be UNESCO-bureaucrat licensing of reporters, a requirement that news be slanted positively toward third world countries and a "international right of reply" which Power explained "would make it possible for the govern-

ment of Nigeria to enforce a retraction from the Farmington Observer if it did not like a story we printed."

"Right now, the big argument is one of means and ends," Power said. "Almost everybody agrees that the desired goal is to improve the ability of lesser developed countries to have good news and communications systems."

"The argument is over the means by which this is to be done: UNESCO takes the position that it should come by restricting western news organizations; we take the position it should come by improving all kinds of news organizations, including native ones."

Power is a member of the board of the World Press Freedom Committee, an international umbrella group working on press freedom.

EMU summer enrollment drops


Summer term enrollment at Eastern Michigan University totaled 5,612 students, a decrease of 5 percent, or 296 students, from the 1980 summer term enrollment figure of 5,908 students.

The summer term headcount included 573 freshmen and sophomores, 2,180 juniors and seniors, and 643 special students. In addition, 2,216 graduate students are registered for the summer term.

In-person registration and program adjustment for the fall term at EMU currently is in progress at the University Registration Office in Briggs Hall. The Registration Office is open from 9 a.m. to noon and from 1 to 5 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday through Friday, the office is open from 8 a.m. to noon and from 1 to 5 p.m.

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
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New attendance policy is given final approval

After a few changes were made, the new attendance policy was given its final approval Monday night by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

Three revisions were made at the request of the Plymouth-Canton Education Association (PCEA), the union for teachers.

With those modifications approved, the PCEA has pledged to work toward making the new policy a success and to work with administration to accomplish an ongoing evaluation of the policy's effectiveness.

One minor change is that a request from parents for an absence to be excused must be in writing.

A second change calls for the establishment of a detention room where students with unexcused absences can be sent for counseling or other help.

The third change was that after a second contact is made with a parent concerning an unexcused absence, the next unexcused absence would result in a mandated assignment to the detention center.

The teachers union and administration is setting up a review committee which will meet monthly to evaluate the new policy to see if it's working. The committee will recommend changes if needed to the school board at the end of the first marking period.

Dr. John M. Hoben, superintendent of schools, stressed that the detention center will not be just a study hall but a place where intervention can take place to deal with the absenteeism or with the problems behind the absences.

Bill Bartlett, a leader of the PCEA, said there will be training on the new policy given to all high school teachers at the beginning of the school year. The review committee will be monitoring whether all teachers are enforcing the policy with consistency.

Richard Egli, administrative assistant for community relations, said the policy will be communicated to parents through school newsletters, via videotape on the school's cable television channel, and by adding a sheet to the student handbook.

The policy is based on the assumption that students belong in class, explained Egli, and is written to avoid the wrong assumption some students make that they are "allowed" a certain number of unexcused absences before disciplinary action is taken.

A key part of the new policy is that it forms a partnership among teachers, administrators and parents to insure that students are in class, added Egli.

One method to make sure parents are kept informed of students who skip class is to ask for business business phone numbers and addresses of where parents work so notification can be made directly without having to rely on mail sent home.

Lunch prices increase as federal help drops

A loss in federal subsidies will result in higher school lunch prices this fall.

Monday night the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education voted 6-1, with trustee Flossie Tonda dissenting, to increase lunch prices for the coming year.

The new prices will be \$1 for elementary pupils, \$1.10 for middle school students and \$1.15 for high schoolers.

The adult price will remain at \$1.55 but will not include a beverage, which is an effective price increase of 20 cents, the price charged for coffee, tea or milk.

Don Petteys, representative of Interstate United which will operate Plymouth-Canton cafeterias this coming school year, says the lunch increases are needed because of decreases in lunch subsidy payments from the federal government.

Petteys noted that the subsidies dropped from 16 cents per lunch to about 11 cents per lunch. The increase in price will merely offset the loss of income from the federal government, he said, and will not add any profit for the operation of cafeterias.

Trustee Tom Yack objected that there was only a difference of 15 cents in the price of elementary lunches and high school lunches. "I can't believe a high school student eats only 15 cents worth of food more than a first-grader."

Dan White, director of finance, said most of the price increase was applied against the secondary level because their food portions are larger.

Petteys told Yack that by the end of the year Interstate would be providing the board with information about the cost of lunch at each building which will give cost information on elementary and secondary lunches.

Trustee Flossie Tonda objected that the prices charged adults were too low and should be raised. "A teacher can pay \$1.55 for a salad at the high school and I'd have to pay 50 cents more for the same kind of salad at Wendy's. That's not right."

Jack Chandler, manager of the Plymouth-Canton cafeteria operation, answered that a private business such as Wendy's has buildings to pay for and advertising expenses which lunch prices must cover, and a school cafeteria doesn't have these costs built into their prices.

Mrs. Tonda added that there was no way that private employees, such as Ford Motor Co. workers, could eat at a company cafeteria for only \$1.55 and so school employees should be charged more for their meals.

In response to a question from the superintendent, Chandler reported that sixth-graders assigned to elementary buildings this year would get smaller food portions and lower prices than sixth graders attending middle school buildings.

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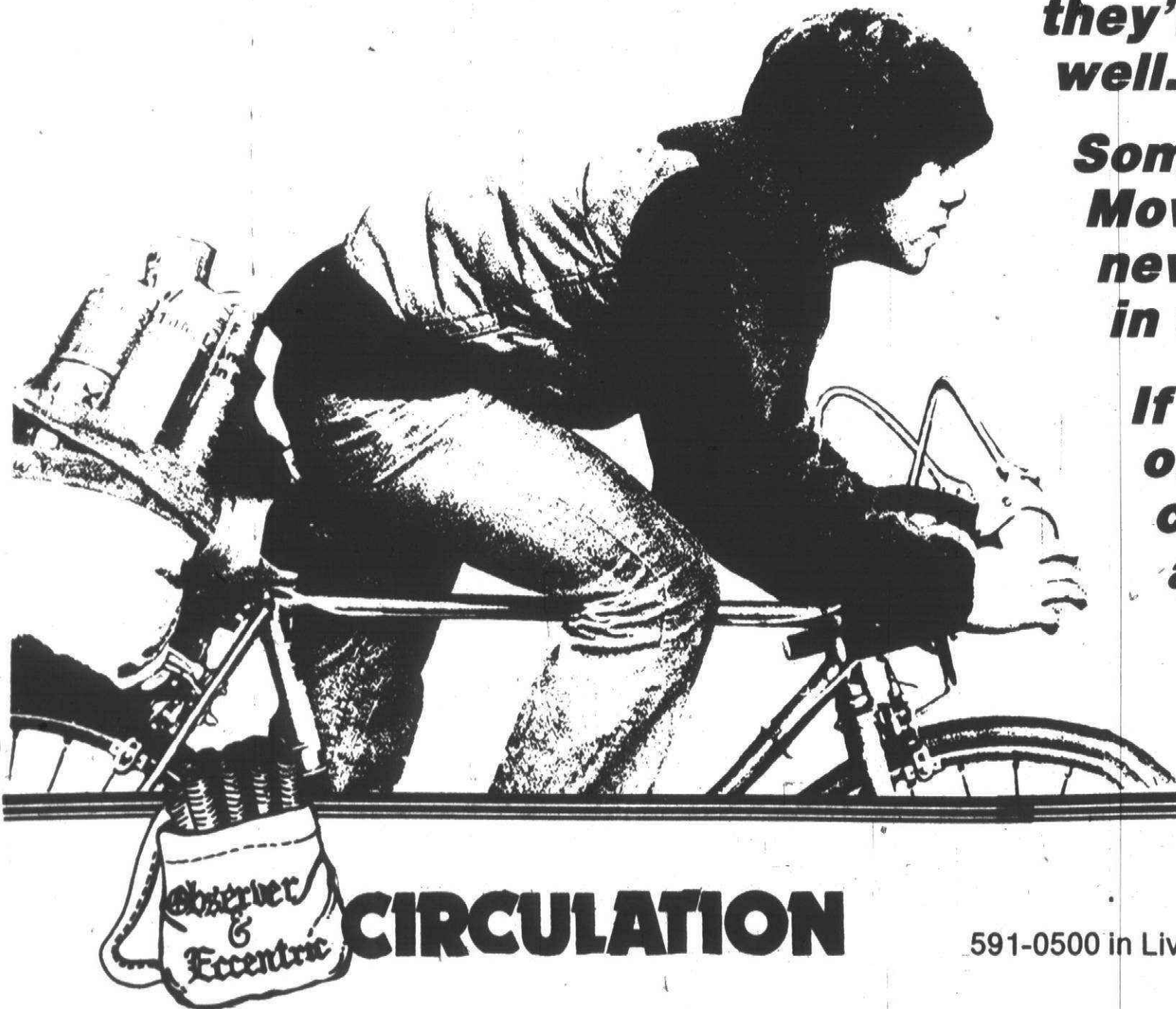
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One county exec looks forward to new one in Wayne

Wayne County's proposed charter has an experienced admirer north of Eight Mile Road.

Oakland's Daniel T. Murphy, first county executive in Michigan, says the charter will give Wayne County residents "better than they've got" in governmental efficiency and accountability.

Those improvements would come if Wayne voters Nov. 3 approve the version of the charter calling for an elected county executive — not if they approve the version with a manager appointed by the Board of Commissioners, Murphy says.

Murphy sees improvements in control over the Road Commission, better coordination of the three public works agencies and better budget controls

over other countywide officeholders.

But he sees little improvement coming from lowering the Board of Commissioners membership from 27 to 15. Murphy was quizzed about the charter in Channel 7's "Spotlight on News," scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Sunday.

In another development, the president of New Detroit indicated satisfaction with most of the charter except for reducing the legislative board's size.

MURPHY HAS had his own differences with the three-man Oakland County Road Commission, which in both counties is appointed by the Board of Commissioners.

The Wayne County charter would give the chief executive officer (CEO) power to appoint road commissioners — much the way a strong city mayor can appoint department heads.

"That would help," Murphy said of

the charter provision. "It would coordinate the activities of county general government with the Road Commission."

"The people in a county don't separate those two. They take the Road Commission as being part of county government. So the executive is expected, in most instances, to answer questions people have concerning the Road Commission when, in fact, in Oakland County we don't have that kind of control."

The Wayne charter, he said, "is better than what we've got (in Oakland). It should go further than that. It (Road Commission) should be completely under the county. But getting the appointment (of the Road Commission) by the executive is a step in the right direction."

DESPITE the political clout the Wayne CEO will have over the three members of the Road Commission, the road unit will still have much autonomy.

Its personnel policies will be separate. Its budget, coming from state gasoline and weight taxes, is separate. Its work program is independently planned.

But Murphy noted the charter requires Wayne County's three public works agencies — the Drain Commission, the Road Commission and the public works department — to submit their annual work programs to the CEO, who will act as coordinator of them all.

As its stands, the Wayne County drain commissioner is an independently elected officeholder, the Road Commission operates autonomously, and the public works department reports to the Board of Commissioners.

to be out on the road and doing the work police officers do, to be a security force."

MURPHY SEES little reform coming from a much-debated Wayne charter provision cutting the size of the county board from 27 to 15. Oakland's board also has 27 members.

A smaller board, he said, would give the CEO fewer commissioners to deal with, but he pointed out that Los Angeles County is governed by a five-member board and many eastern counties by three.

"If you're going to lower it, then lower it substantially to five or seven. If you lower it to 15 or 18, that's not much different than dealing with 25 or 27," Murphy said.

Elected in 1974, Murphy is in his third term. Oakland was the first Michigan county to adopt the executive form, and Bay County followed last year.

IN THE STUDIO waiting to tape another program was Walter Douglas, president of New Detroit, the urban coalition. In an interview after the tapings, Douglas disagreed with Murphy on the board size.

Blacks, said Douglas, proposed lowering the board size to 21, but the board's white majority first voted for a 27-member board, then slashed it to 15. Douglas said blacks were bothered "not by the end result but the way it was done."

He said Michigan would look bad if, when figures on black officeholders are compiled, it appears in 1983 that their numbers are declining.

Otherwise, Douglas was happy with the charter. "I hope the board (of New Detroit) will say it's good enough to support."

In Oakland County, the situation is the same with the drain commissioner and Road Commission, but the public works department comes under the executive.

THE CHARTER would be "not sufficient" if Wayne voters opted for an appointive manager, Murphy said.

"Other elected officials — the clerk, the sheriff — would still have that same 'in' they've got with little groups on the county board," he said.

The same criticism of county government comes from reform advocates in Wayne. They contend the six independent officeholders — sheriff, prosecutor, clerk, treasurer, drain commissioner and register of deeds — need only find 14 friends on the county board in order to frustrate overall budget policy. This lack of overall budget control, they argue, is a chief reason Wayne County keeps running budget deficits.

Murphy agreed with the charter group's decision not to require the Sheriff's Department to provide security for the county building. Republican Murphy has had the same argument with Democrats in Oakland who want that responsibility to go to Sheriff Johannes Spreen, also a Democrat.

"THE EXECUTIVE Act (PA 139) makes the executive responsible for all county buildings — maintenance, safety and a number of other things," said Murphy.

"If that's his responsibility, he can't depend on the sheriff, who has a constitutional office. If you need to secure buildings and all of a sudden the sheriff needs those people someplace else, it's his prerogative to put 'em where he wants them."

"It should be a security force that are not deputies, that you don't have to pay the kind of money you pay deputies

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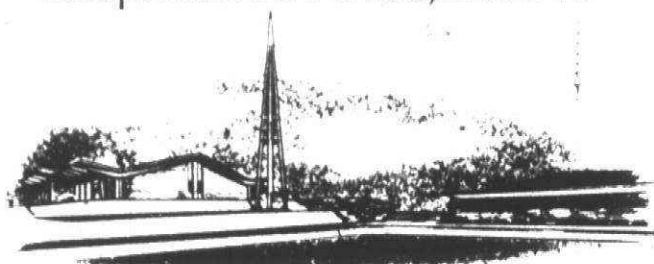
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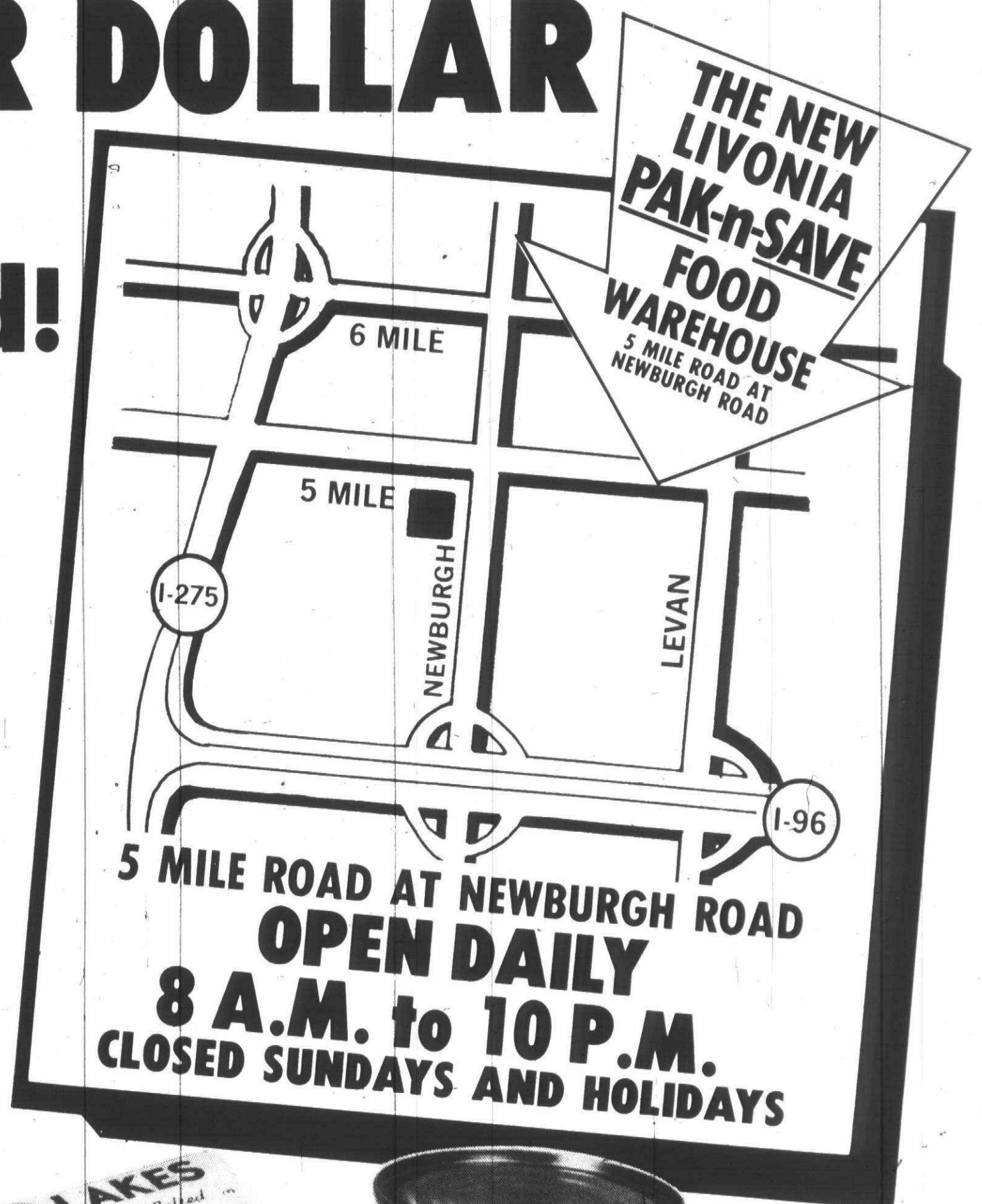

More highway funds for state

Michigan will receive an additional \$56 million in federal highway funds for fiscal year 1981.

That announcement was made this week by U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, who is congressman from the 2nd District which includes Livonia, Plymouth, Northville, parts of Washtenaw and Monroe counties.

Pursell is a member of the transportation subcommittee of the House Appropriations Committee.

According to the formula set forth by Congress, Michigan received 80 percent of its federal highway grant at the beginning of the fiscal year.

By verifying the use of these monies and the need for continued funding, said Pursell, Michigan qualified for the remaining 20 percent or \$56 million which will be distributed this month by the U.S. Department of Transportation.

The additional highway funding was announced at about the same time it was learned that Michigan was assured \$40 million in federal funds for public transportation programs between now and October 1982.

"I feel an efficient and balanced transportation network is essential to

the revitalization of Michigan," said Pursell. "Adequate transportation will encourage the economic development of our state by bringing jobs to the people, as well as people to the jobs."

Leave garage sales alone

To the editor:
(An open letter to the Plymouth City Commission regarding proposed garage sale restrictions.)

This letter is in response to an article in the Observer concerning controls over garage sales.

As a devotee of such sales, I would be the first to admit abuses, having been frustrated many times following signs on telephone poles which were a week or so out of date.

I also would not be happy with a neighbor who carried on a lengthy sale with its attendant traffic and noise. I am sure the complaints you have received are justified and legitimate, but you must remember for every complaint there are literally hundreds of others who have garage sales and have the utmost consideration for both their neighbors and their customers.

Being proud of Plymouth, I do not like to see poles littered with signs after their usefulness has expired. But it would be impossible to find sales without them, especially in the new subdivisions where the streets wind around. As usual, however, it is the inconsiderate few who make it tough for those of us

who want to do the right thing.
The \$10 fee for each sale is impossibly high. Sometimes, because of the weather or lack of customers, that would represent about a fourth of the total sales. Having a fee at all is an infringement of our right to dispose of goods which is rightly ours to do with what we see fit.

Garage sales are a refined form of barter which certainly dates far back in our history. The president is trying very hard to get government off our backs, but a proposal like this is a restriction on our freedom and puts the city in the position of Big Brother, telling us what we should do in what is essentially a private matter.

Perhaps some sort of ordinance could be enacted in which only complaints could be acted on. Generally, people have to be pushed quite far before they will make a complaint on a fellow neighbor. So acting on these complaints might be the thing to do rather than causing everyone to go to city hall and get a license and pay a fee.

It is the usual case of the law-abiding majority being inconvenienced and penalized for the few bad apples you will find in any city. I am also sure that no one at city hall is looking forward to the book work and record keeping that charging a fee would entail.

Please don't burden our over-regulated lives. Garage sales are a tremendous source of sayings to the senior citizens looking for gifts for the grandchildren, to the mothers whose kids are growing inches in front of their eyes, to the serious collector who thrills at finding a piece of china or whatever at a nominal price, and finally to the average housewife who is trying to survive in these economically depressed times.

I am sure you can find a way to check these inconsiderate few who continue to have multiple sales or fail to remove signs.

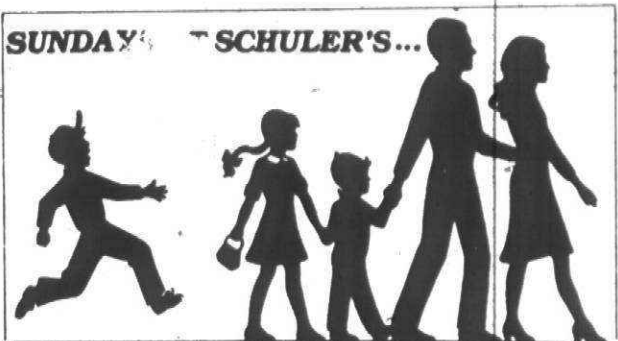

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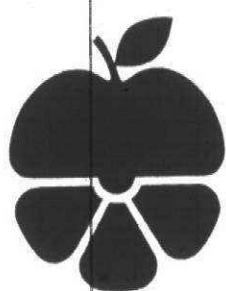
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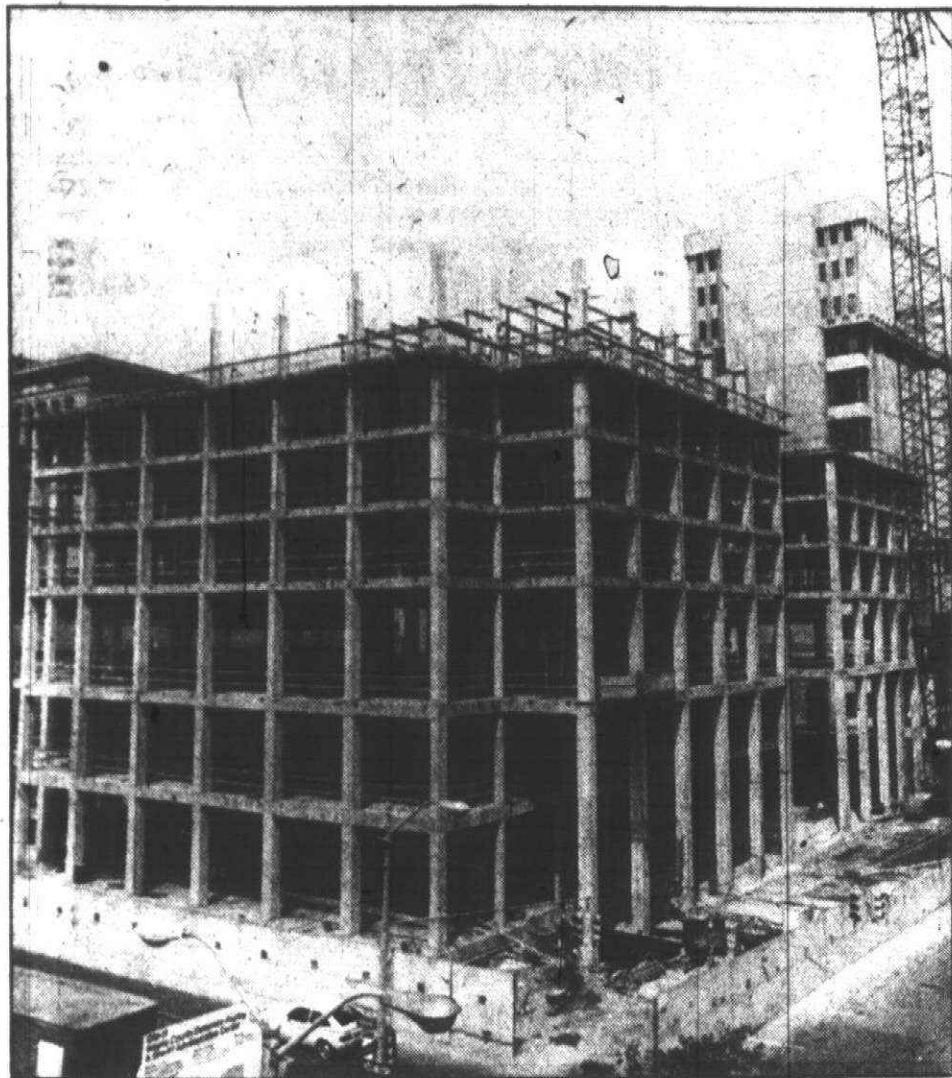

County jail on schedule, within budget



The new Wayne County Jail will be ready for occupancy in September 1983, two years after property owners finish paying for it. It's at Macomb and St. Antoine in downtown Detroit.

With seven of its 12 floors already completed, Wayne County's new \$45 million jail at Macomb and St. Antoine Streets in downtown Detroit should be ready for occupancy by September 1983, according to county board Chairman Samuel A. Turner.

Turner said that although the cost has more than doubled in the past 10 years, the county's investment of taxes collected for jail construction county has helped keep pace with inflation.

"Taxpayers will note that they are no longer paying the half-mill property tax levied in 1976 which, during its five-year term, had raised some \$40 million. The additional \$6.4 million in accrued interest and credits on the special fund will be enough to cover all costs by April 1983.

COMPLETION of the 600-cell jail should help take the heat off of local police departments. They were warned several weeks ago by Chief Circuit Court Judge Richard D. Dunn that they might be forced to detain overflow prisoners from the jail if the number exceeds the 1,013 capacity.

The fact that the jail is on schedule came as a surprise to many who saw initial sinking of 120-foot-deep caissons and foundation construction stalled for over a year when a subterranean basement of the former Recorder's Court building was discovered intact.

Frustrated over complications, the Wayne County Board of Commissioners agreed to a recommendation by James D. Beyster, director of the buildings division for the Board of Auditors, to hire the construction-management firm of Barton-Malow in July 1980 to complete the job and guarantee to keep within the allotted time frame.

"They've done very well," Beyster

commented. "We're moving right along."

Commissioners were also satisfied with the success of their special 25 percent set-aside for small and minority contractors currently working with the prime contractor, said Beyster.

"It's the first time a large governmental unit has carried out such an imaginative program, and it's due, to a large part, to the county's human rights director, Donald Gray.

"The set-aside has won national acclaim and accomplish what the commissioners envisioned: to provide an opportunity for small companies to take part in the construction of a multi-million-dollar project. Gray said more than a dozen subcontractors and suppliers are participating."

AS FOR alleviating the perennial problem of crowding, Undersheriff Loren Pittman said the additional 600 cells will be filled rapidly with hundreds of offenders who have been allowed to roam the streets for lack of space.

"Today's prisoner count for both the old jail and the Westland annex is 1,000, just 13 short of the maximum capacity. Judges, mindful of the jail crowding, have been forced to release prisoners who should rightfully be incarcerated," said Pittman.

The half-mill county property tax (50 cents per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation) levied in 1976 specifically for constructing a new jail raised an average of \$7.5 million each year until this past year when it topped \$9 million. Of that, \$5 million has already been paid to contractors and suppliers leaving an anticipated balance in April 1983 of \$40.3 million.

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State suit takes aim at mortgage rates

Attorney General Frank J. Kelley has filed a federal court action seeking a ruling that federal law does not take precedence over Michigan's maximum interest rate laws on second mortgages.

Kelley said in a written statement that so-called "wrap-around" mortgages are exempt from the federal law when taken out by a person who al-

ready owns the house used as collateral in the mortgage.

The suit names the Farmington-based Group Ten Mortgage Co. as a defendant. The company was embroiled in a series of disputed wrap-around mortgages last month.

The state usury law limits second mortgages to 15 percent interest.

Petition drive targets due-on-sale mortgages

A petition drive is being launched to fight the practice by Michigan savings and loan associations which foreclose on mortgage loans to block house buyers from assuming older, low-interest loans.

Sandy Eichenhorn, treasurer of the Consumer's Committee to Protect Mortgage Rights, said the group is soliciting 350,000 signatures of registered voters to place their issue on the ballot.

The freedom to buy and sell property is currently being taken away by lenders operating in Michigan, said Eichenhorn, a commercial real estate investment broker in Southfield.

"Potential buyers who are prevented from taking over low-interest mortgages find they cannot afford house payments based on today's higher interest rates" of 16 and 17-plus percent, he said.

(48 months) to take a foreclosed property back and, therefore, would not attempt to enforce due-on-sale for non-credit reasons," he said.

"While protecting savings and loans from bad credit risks," said Eichenhorn, a commercial real estate investment broker, the proposed changes in state law "would also protect consumers from losing their right to freely buy and sell property."

"Suppose you bought a home for \$70,000, paying \$10,000 down and obtaining a mortgage loan to cover the balance," Eichenhorn said. "Let's assume that the interest rate was fixed at 8 1/2 percent for a term of 30 years, making your monthly payments \$461.35."

"You later find you must sell your home, but the lender informs you that now the purchaser taking over your mortgage will have to pay 17 1/2 percent on the loan, making their payments \$879.80."

"Suddenly, by an arbitrary decision of the lender, your 30-year, fixed-rate mortgage has ceased to exist," Eichenhorn said. "The new purchaser can't afford these payments, and the deal falls through."

"MOREOVER, you don't have the choice of selling on land contract, either," he said. "Even though, in a land contract, you would still be making payments on the mortgage, lenders view such a sale as a transfer of property and, therefore, invoke this insidious clause."

Eichenhorn said most conventional mortgages made in the last five years contain "this apparently innocuous, but deadly, due-on-sale clause."

A spokesman said the Consumer's Committee to Protect Mortgage Rights is composed of real estate professionals and consumers.

THEIR PETITION drive, if successful, would place two proposed changes in state law on the November 1982 ballot:

• Lenders would no longer be allowed automatically to invoke the "due-on-sale" clause requiring the borrower to pay off the loan when he sells his house. The clause could be invoked only if the prospective buyer lacks creditworthiness.

• If a foreclosure occurred, the home seller would be allowed 48 months to repay the loan instead of the current 6-12 months.

Eichenhorn said the goal is to halt the lenders' practice of foreclosing on mortgages to avoid low-interest assumptions and land-contract sales — a practice which forces buyers to seek new mortgages at current high interest rates.

What is SC board really looking for?

Can you read the collective minds of Schoolcraft College trustees?

The seven trustees include four men and three women ranging in age from 29 to, well, someplace in the 60s. They span the political spectrum, from a Tisch-type conservative to union-loving liberal.

During the last two weeks, they interviewed five candidates seeking a new president, and they asked all kinds of questions.

And that is the game: Which answers will really determine who becomes Schoolcraft's third president?

Here are the questions so that you, too, may play the game.

"WHAT IS THE MOST important role of the president?" Treasurer Len Wozniak would ask. A surface-scratcher.

"What changes do you see in the role of the community college in the 1980s? How do you see Schoolcraft serving the needs of a changing student body?" Trustees Rosina Raymond and Paul Kadish would toss in those.

They look like good questions, but the candidates' answers sound alike. All said more women, more older persons, more persons with B.A. degrees seeking new job skills in mid-career would show up. Actually, that change has already occurred.

"Describe 'developmental' programs and how they relate to the student body." New trustee Laura Toy's question was a sleeper. Schoolcraft apparently got less than perfect marks from the North Central Association accrediting team in its developmental work with persons (e.g., housewives who never worked, long-ago dropouts) who have been away from education awhile. I suspect the new president, whoever he be, will come on like gang busters in developmental work.

"WHAT ROLE do you see a community college playing in state economic redevelopment efforts?" Trustee Michael Burley's question made several candidates wax eloquent.

"Explain your budgetary allocation process? What would you do if the governor has to cut the budget in midyear? Explain your long-range planning process." All important questions from Kadish and Nancy Blatt, but again the answers sound alike, though it was apparent some had more experience than others.

"What is your experience in collective bargaining?" Here was an opening question from Mrs. Raymond to test candidates in the field of faculty relations. Schoolcraft faculty morale hasn't been the highest, to put it politely. The new man will have some repair work to do.

"AFFIRMATIVE ACTION in administrative hiring —" Rosina Raymond's baby. Schoolcraft's administrative structure has been very stable for many years, with little chance for women to move up, even though former President C. Nelson Grote tried. Because of vacancies, the new president will name practically a whole new administration in five years or so.

"Relations with legislators?" The interview process will not provide the answers; trustee visits to the candidates' present campuses will provide better answers. But it's highly important in a state where there is a tough political struggle for scarce public funds.

The two finalists are Dr. Lyle Robertson of Macomb County Community College and Dr. Richard McDowell of the Community College of Allegheny County, Pa. Both are vice presidents and in their 40s.

Either way, Schoolcraft probably has a winner.

Patterson hits the trail

Campaign aides inflated a hot air balloon emblazoned with "Patterson For Governor" outside on Telegraph Road as Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson formally announced his candidacy for governor.

In his address in a Bloomfield Township hall packed with some 600 supporters, Patterson backed the death penalty, lambasted the proposed Woodward subway, supported repeal of the state's single business tax and criticized early release of prison inmates to eliminate overcrowding.

Scheduled to make a statewide swing of press conferences and campaign announcements later in the day, Patterson left the hall by a back door immediately after his prepared address and

did not answer questions from reporters.

THE 42-YEAR-OLD prosecutor is the second Republican (after state Sen. John Welborn of Kalamazoo) to enter the 1982 race. They are betting that after 14 years Gov. William G. Milliken will not seek reelection. The "establishment" candidate is likely to be Lt. Gov. James Brickley.

Patterson has been less than popular with the Republican establishment since his unsuccessful 1978 challenge of U.S. Sen. Robert P. Griffin.

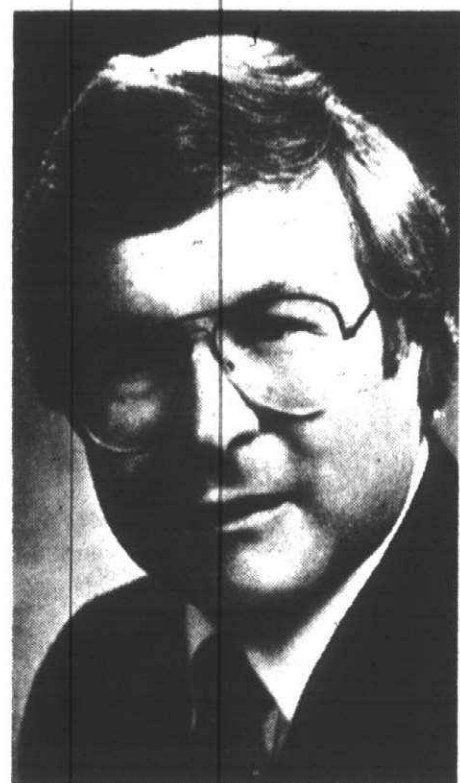
Many Oakland County Republican figures were on hand for Patterson's declaration, including Patrick Nowak, political right-hand man of County Executive Daniel Murphy. Nowak, however, said his presence was not an indication of support by Murphy for Patterson.

Patterson drew applause from the crowd, which had paid \$25 each for coffee and rolls, when he criticized the state's business climate.

"I consider it high time that jobs and job security become the priority in Michigan," he said. "I suggest to you that state government must be stone deaf if it cannot hear the raised voices of the 495,000 people in Michigan today who are out of work."

PATTERSON AGAIN drew applause when he criticized the state's single business tax, which he said "levies an onerous burden on business."

The crowd failed to respond, however, when Patterson said his candidacy was further spurred "because a majority of Michigan citizens want reinstatement of capital punishment to deter cold-blooded murder, and yet our state government will not take that step."

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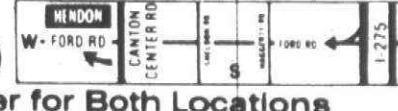

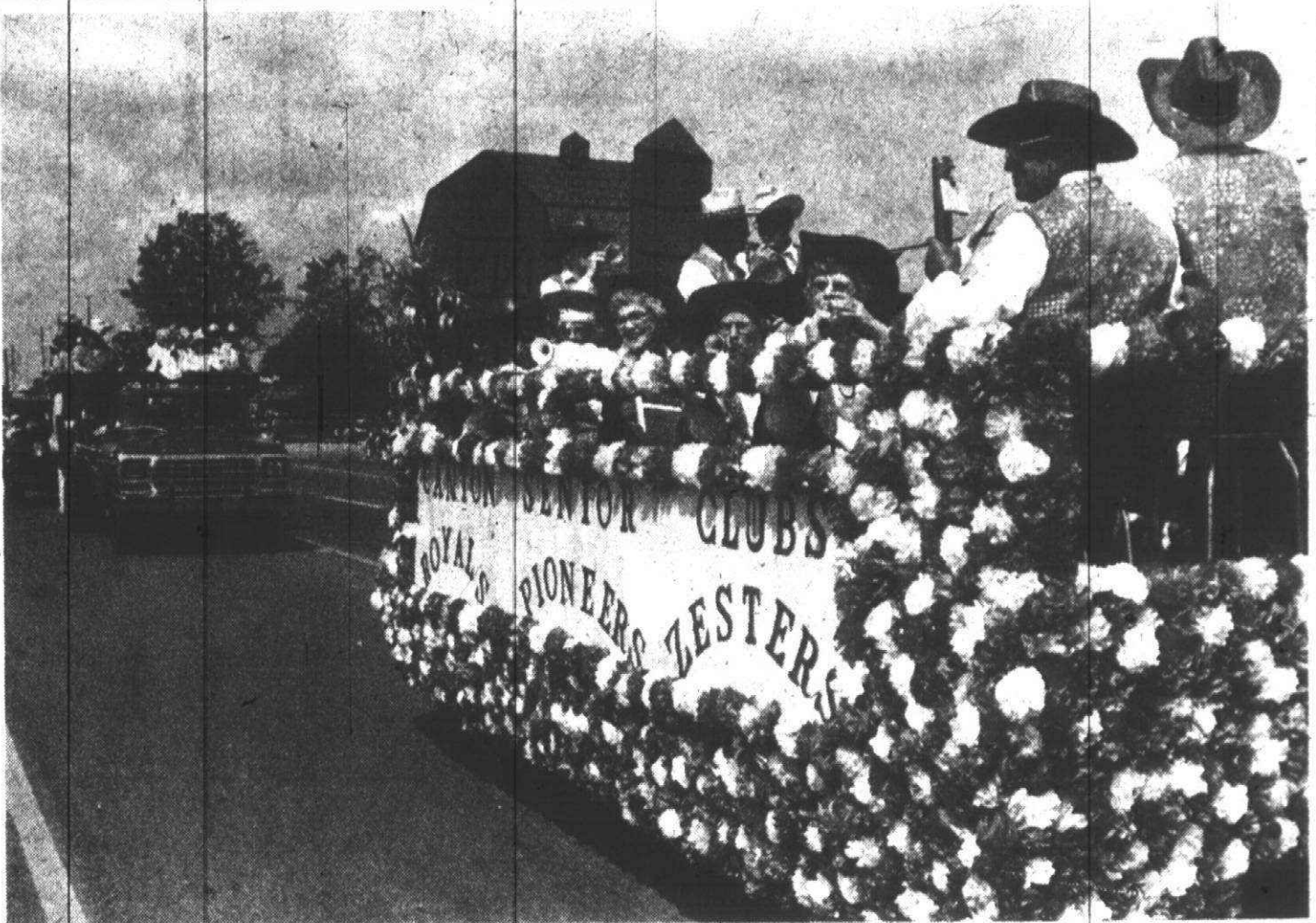

Take me out to the (water) ball game

volunteers' skills in hose handling.

The teams are getting in shape and planning their strategies for the great water ball tournament scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 12. The games will be played "according to Hoyle." International Water Ball Rules, observed throughout the games, will eliminate the dirty tricks employed by old-time firefighters.

There is still fire-house talk about their predecessors and the games on Main Street — before it was paved. In those days, they played with a barrel instead of a suspended ball. It was not uncommon for a nozzle man to feign weak wrists and with the hose at just the right angle, spray the opposition with a hail of stones and mud.

The city of Plymouth team is pretty well organized. They have been meeting for Saturday morning practice at the Packaging Corporation of America parking lot. Bruce Burrow has been working as nozzleman with Paul Pavloff as back-up, Norm Tritton on hose, and Bob Steinebach on guard hose. All are volunteer firefighters and manned the team which won the first place trophy at the Northville Fourth of July games. They were coached by Capt. Paul Sanders of the Plymouth Fire Department.

"We won at Northville then got clobbered in the big one at Greenfield Village," said Burrow. He added that Fire Chief Roy Hall encouraged their participation because it added to the

THE WATER ball fights will be a major Saturday attraction at Plymouth Fall Festival. Crowds lined Penniman Avenue last year to watch the water ball games and to look at the collection of old fire engines and equipment assembled for the festival.

The women, mostly wives of firefighters, also tried their hands at water ball and will do it again this year.

They too will wear the protective gear specified in the international rules.

Each member of a water ball team must wear a standard fireman's helmet or safety helmet of their choice; standard fireman's boots and standard fireman's coats.

The rules state that each team will consist of four men and a coach. The fieldmen must cross streams over the ball before the signal to start the contest. The fieldmen are permitted to stand any distance back of the 15-foot starting line at the beginning of the contest. After the contest is started, they are free to maneuver any place on the playing field.

The three fieldmen may change position during any three-minute heat. Between any heat, any of the five team members may change place. Teams change ends for the second heat of the contest.

The nozzle pressure shall be 90 pounds with both lead nozzles open plus one guard nozzle.

The two nozzle men must cross

streams over ball before signal to start contest.

The guard (this is the man with the second hose, the guard hose) must stay back of the guard line 40 feet from center at all times, while the contest is under way. The guard may turn on the nozzle when ball is on 7 1/2-foot mark and must shut it off at three-foot mark from center point. All timing and judging shall be done from the center of the ball.

The two teams in the final playoff shall have a 10-minute rest period before the game starts with a three-minute rest between heats.

THE GAME IS played in three-minute heats and the winning team is the one which controls the ball the greater length of time.

The international rules explain the method of timing:

There shall be one starter and two timekeepers, all of whom are classed as judges, with all judges' decisions final.

If contest is stopped because of trouble with equipment or lack of water, the ball shall be started from where it was when the failure took place.

Fifteen seconds will be credited to team scoring a goal. A goal is scored by driving the ball into opponents' territory and against cable stops 45 feet from center.

The 15-second credit for scoring a goal shall not be counted as playing time.

On completion of a goal, the ball is to be started at center using balance of the three-minute time of heat.

There is no scoring time kept while ball is in "dead time" area.

WATER BALL becomes a spectator sport when the onlookers are familiar with the rules and the penalties. Even when the crowds are thoroughly dampened by spray from the hoses and fascinated by the watery sport, it helps to know what is legal and what isn't.

The entire team can be disqualified

for intentional throwing or dropping the nozzle on the playing field; for intentionally directing hose stream at opponents; or, at the judges' discretion, for interference by coach of friendly spectators.

Substitution for physical discomfort shall be allowed in hoseman position. Man leaving shall be disqualified from the contest. No other substitutes will be permitted with the exception of injury to a player.

There is a five-second penalty for each illegal use of guard hose.

Bruce Burrow explained that water ball can be a dangerous sport, especially if a player is hit in the eye with a 90-pound pressure stream of water.

Special hoses are used in the game. Regular fire hoses can be adjusted to eject foam and mist as well as a stream of water. A single pumper is used with a forked or Y-shaped hose to insure equal pressure for each team.

"We know it changed hands three times before we bought it," added Westfall.

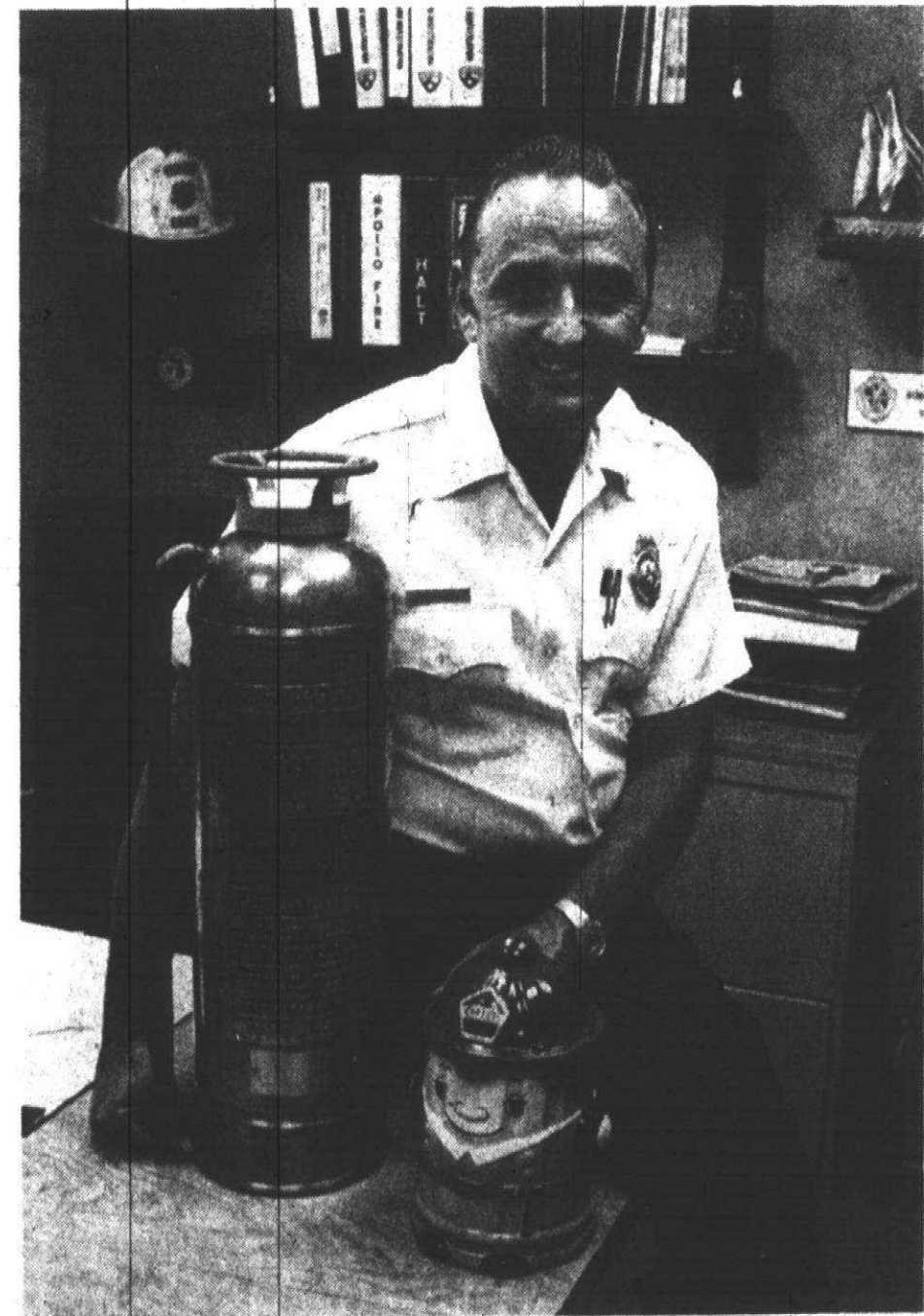
THE ON-THE-RUN Fire Company will have two water ball teams entered

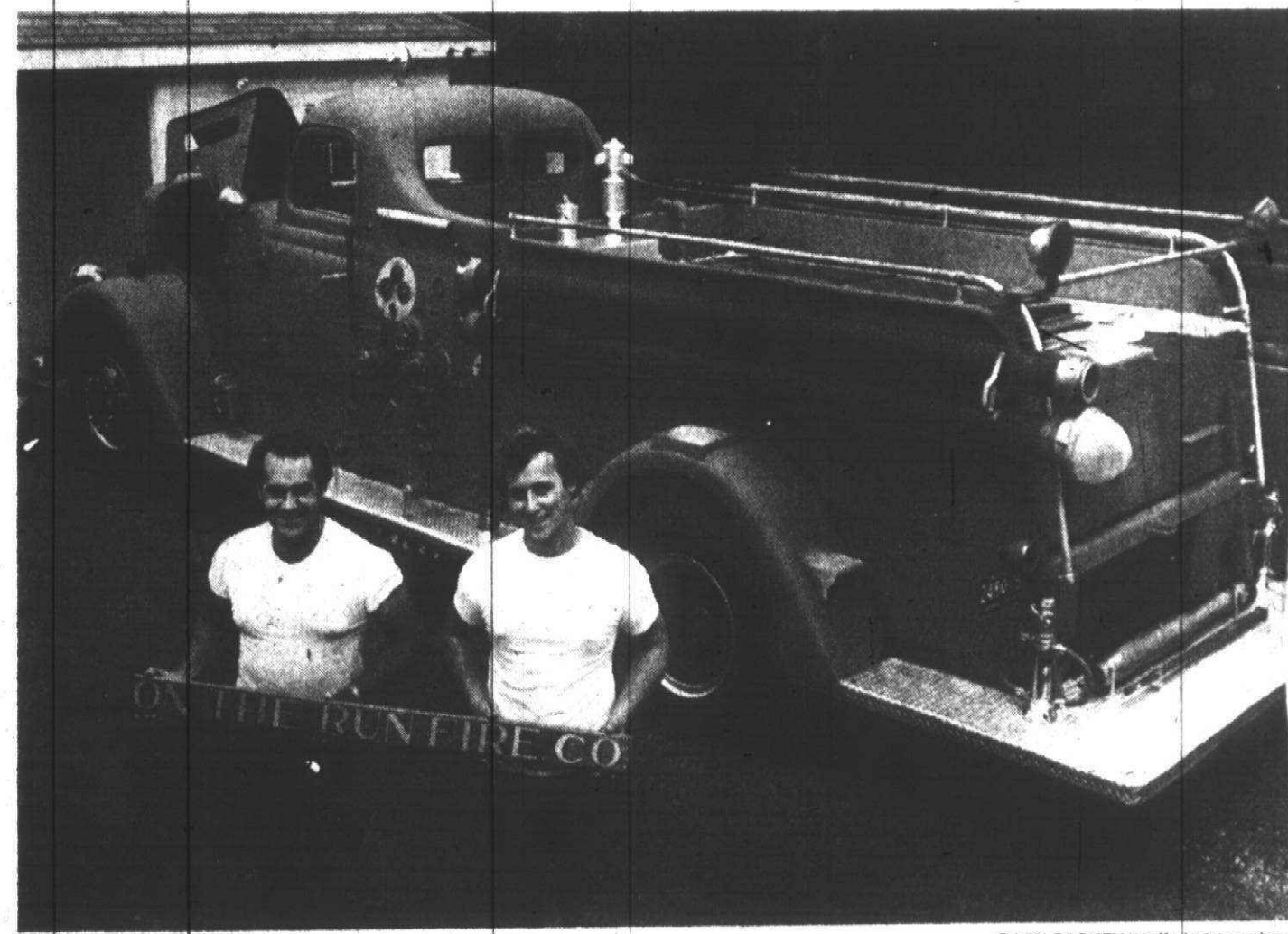

Theirs is a new marriage, a new crusading career

Mike Riley and Laurie Shoemaker, planning to walk down the aisle together Aug. 22, also are planning to walk high school corridors together later to win young people to the Christian life.

After an Aug. 22 wedding, the couple hope to leave in September for San Diego to join the staff of the high school ministries program of Campus Crusade for Christ International.

The two 1980 University of Michigan graduates — Laurie also graduated in 1976 from Stevenson High School and Mike from Churchill High — already have been accepted by the non-profit charismatic organization and in January and February took preliminary training for their venture.

What remains now is combining wedding preparations with visits to groups that might give financial support to a career that the two young people are anxious to begin.

"God willing, we'll leave in mid-September for San Diego and will work on

the staff there that develops programs for a high school ministry," Mike said.

"The purpose of this portion of Campus Crusade International is to develop quality programs in high schools around the country. San Diego is the 18th city, and the Campus Crusade goal is 50."

THE COUPLE began thinking of this brand of missionary work even before they began making plans for the wedding that will take place in St. Paul United Presbyterian Church of Livonia.

"My major at Michigan was secondary education," Mike said, "and I've always been much interested in young people. I've known about Campus Crusade, which was established in 1951 by Dr. Bill Bright, who felt there should be an evangelistic outreach to college students who are the country's future leaders."

"When I found out that the organization also included a high school ministry, I felt that was a good place for me."

Laurie majored in psychology and learned more about Campus Crusade through Mike.

"I decided it was what I wanted to do too," she said.

Their training in California was at the Institute for Biblical Studies, San Bernardino. They took condensed courses in Old Testament, New Testament, Christian marriage and Christian life and then had two weeks with members of the CC high school ministry staff in San Diego.

THEIR VISITS in search of support for their work have been fairly successful, they said.

"We're basically the same as missionaries going to Africa," Mike noted, "except that we are home mission types."

"We've found people like to give to the people we help — high school students in this country. We will send out a monthly report to let people know what we are doing. They like to know how their money is working."

The plan for their work in San Diego is the setting up of a model high school ministry.

Groups or churches interested in their project may call Mike at 427-8560.

"We'll work mainly in the schools rather than in the churches," he said. "The impact we hope to have on church youth leaders is by letting them see what we are doing among high school students."

The assignment to staff work at first is a good one, they think, because it will give them a little more time to establish their own personal relationships after their marriage.

And they are looking forward to the work in San Diego. But farther down the road they think there may be assignments closer to home — the Campus Crusade list also includes Cincinnati, Indianapolis, Chicago and Minneapolis.

"And then," said Laurie, "we really hope we can get something started in Michigan."

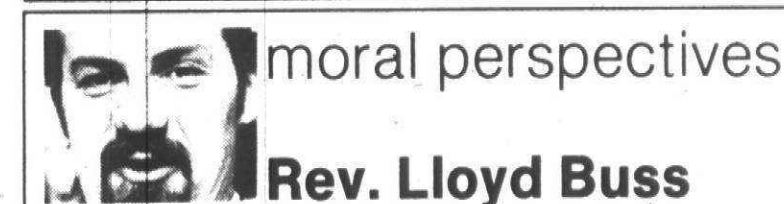

Pastor faults Gilder's attitude toward capitalism

It was imaginative. And imagination is an essential part of creativity. But it detracted from the solution. It was misleading.

The late radio-comedian Robert Burns had a method for weighing hogs which featured a plank balanced across a sawhorse. Putting the hog on one end he would pile rocks on the opposite end until the plank was balanced on the sawhorse.

Then he would estimate the weight of the rocks to give him the weight of the hogs.

George Gilder has used the same technique in his book "Wealth and Poverty." Acclaimed by some as the essential book to understand the way people in Washington are thinking these days, the book makes a strong claim that capitalism begins with giving, and then repeatedly insists that the demand for goods and money through welfare seriously jeopardize capitalism.

It turns out that Gilder's capitalism can only give to those who have something worthwhile to give back in return. The giving in capitalism is merely a technique to set the process in motion that will effect a return.

GILDER CLAIMS that the major problem for capitalism in the United States today is the excessive demand made by those who have little or nothing to return in exchange. In fact, he writes, "the more we give aid to the unemployed, the divorced, the deviant, and the prodigal, the more common their ill become, and the graphs of social breakdown more alarming."

Gilder also claims that the poor and lower classes have to work harder than the classes above them to rise out of poverty and that they have failed to do so. The sectors of life providing the op-

portunities for employment today, however — the government and service industries — are also the most inflationary, because they do not build or manufacture final products.

The expanding government and service industry will only hasten the demise of capitalism because it accents consumption instead of productivity.

Equally disconcerting to Gilder is governmental (public) interference and regulation of capitalism. If capitalism were left to itself, it would work out the best interests of all. Since the process of redistribution is based on serious misunderstandings of the nature and source of wealth, it is only the fundamentally incomprehensible, but nonetheless providential universe that can fully accommodate and nurture properly the process of capitalism.

IF ROBERT BURNS had used stones of known weight on the opposite end of his plank with the hogs, he could have quickly ascertained the weight of the hogs. If George Gilder had used the outline of the Bill of Rights and the Constitution of the United States as his standard for the measurement of capitalism, he could have quickly ascertained its purposeful role in our public life.

By elevating it to a position of inviolate authority he misrepresented its responsibility and discredited its purpose. The Judeo-Christian heritage has been very explicit and precise about the dangers of idolatry.

Asserting the priority of capitalism as a system and trusting its own process as the full measure of God's providence to the citizens of this land is to reject the responsibility we have to deliberately care for one another, and to worship it as a god.

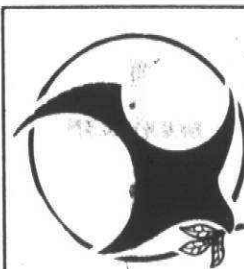

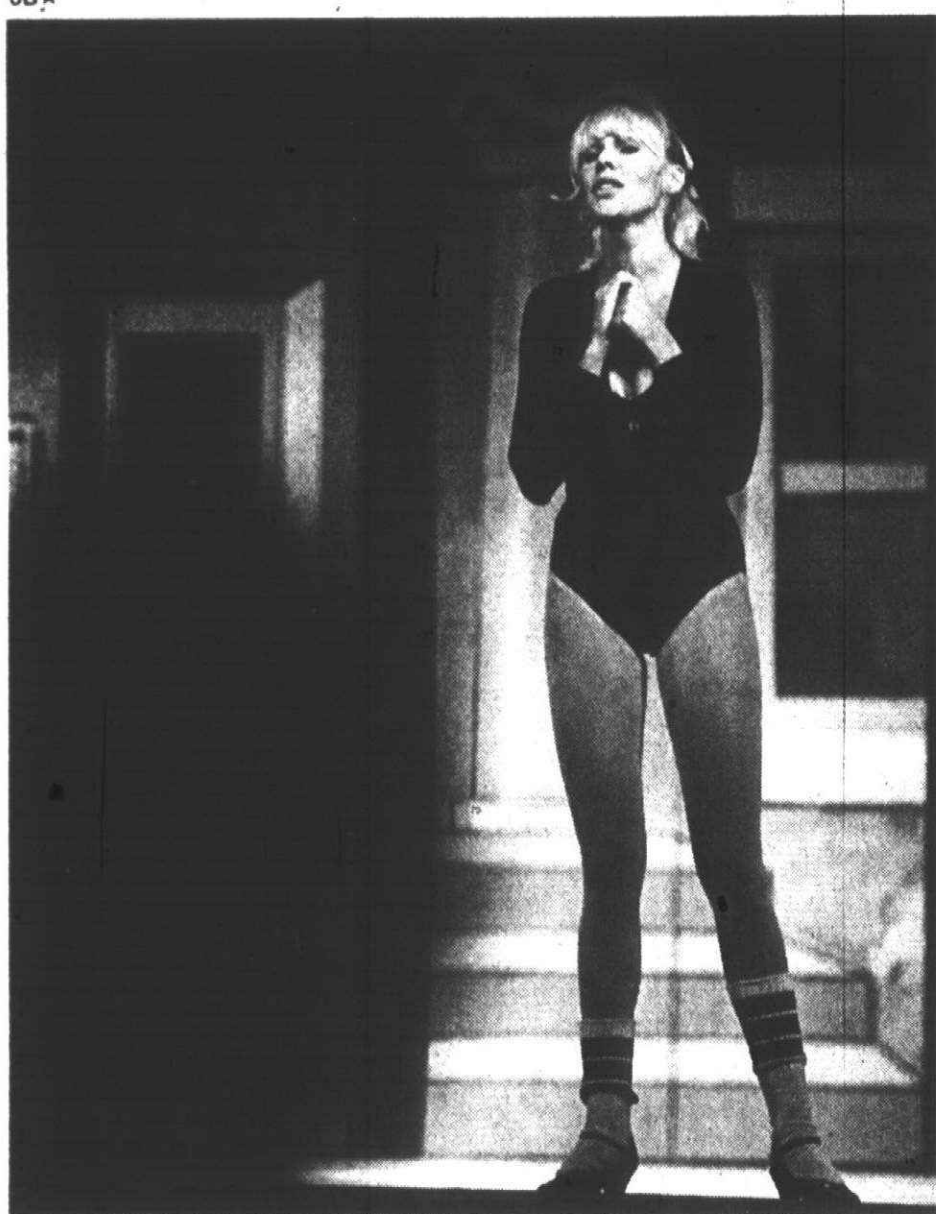

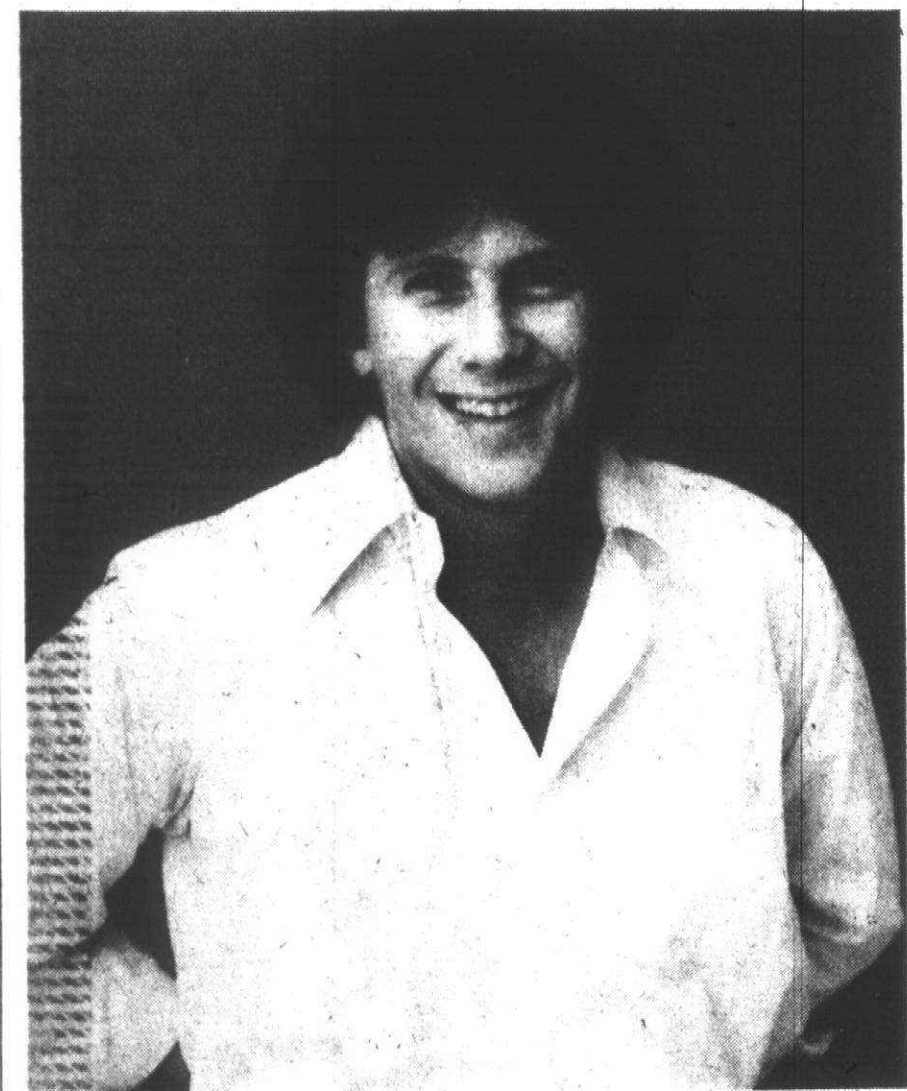

THE BACK GAME

In the example, black has a 1-6 to play. Black has the doubling cube at 2. What is your move?

Black must enter white's home board on the 1 point. For the 6 move, there are only two options — to hit or play safe.

It is tempting for black to hit the white blot on the 9 point with a checker from the 3 point. However, if black decides to hit white, he will have to abandon the 3 point — leaving a blot exposed and giving up a very strong holding point, which later could prove fatal.

If you are contemplating hitting white on the 9 point, you must first consider the advantages and disadvantages. With white holding a five-point prime and black having a weak home board, hitting white would not exactly benefit black at this time. So the natural play would be for black to move any one of the outer board checkers, preferably from the 12 to the 6 point.

One important key to winning backgammon is to recognize when it is proper to hit and when you should pass up a chance to hit.

To the average player, passing up an opportunity to hit may not make sense, but consider this: By hitting white, black would actually be helping white's timing. By slowing white's forward progress, white would be able to maintain his five-point prime until he brings home the hit checker.

In the interim, white may close the newly opened 3 point and the open 2 point for a strong home board. Black

would then lose his second anchor in white's home board, which is key for the back game strategy. Black would do best to wait for another opportunity to hit after he has fortified his home board.

You may be asking yourself what will happen if white does not leave another shot. With black owning the 1 and the 3 points, the odds dictate that white should leave another shot while bearing in. But the pressure is still on black to hit and contain white.

As long as black can hold the 1 and 3 points, white could also leave a shot while bearing off; this is possible because black has a fifth checker back to help black preserve his timing.

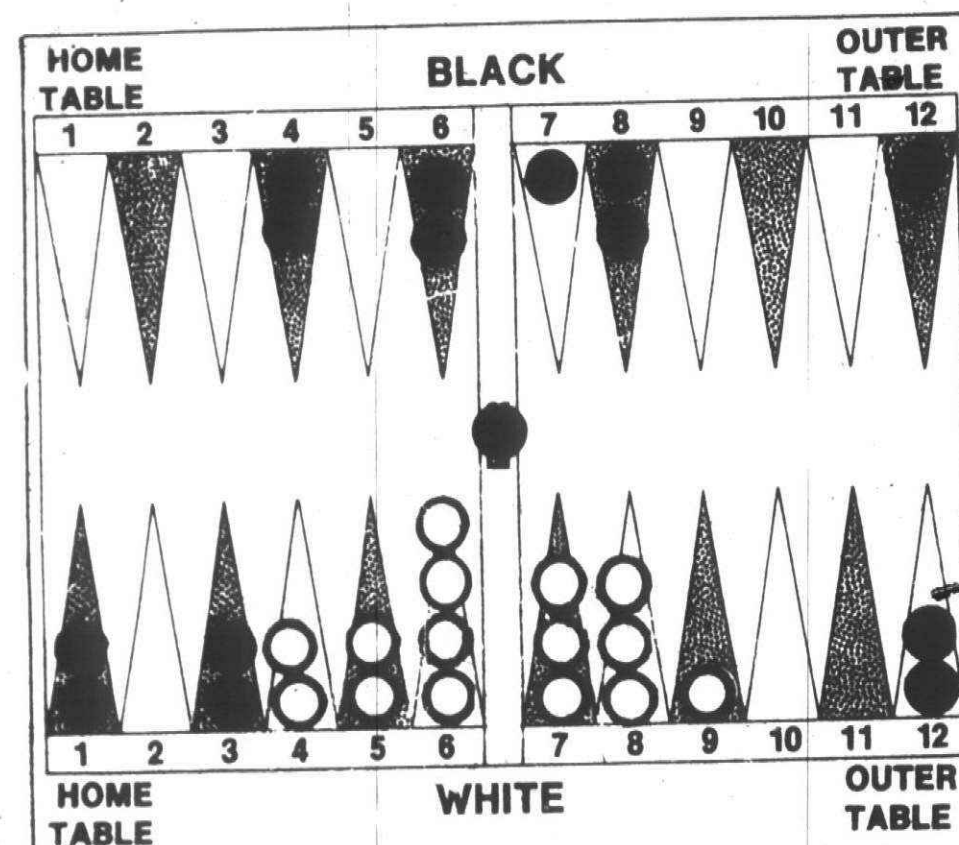
Since black owns the doubling cube, once he hits white he could be in position to redouble white out of the game with a strong home board.

Black's back game position is not infallible, by any means. If white leaves a shot, black may still miss the hit. But that's what makes backgammon an exciting game!

In the championship, Craiger started out fast in the first inning when the tournament's most valuable player, Tom Moore, singled to start off the game. Steve Sobditch walked after Moore stole second, and Mark Harbaugh singled home the game's first run.

Canton scored four times in the second to take a 5-0 lead.

Harbaugh walked and stole second base. Dominic De Bello laid down a perfect bunt single and Dave Briski, Craiger's acquisition from Westland and winner of the tourney batting title, ripped an RBI single. Moore followed with a two-run single. Mike McKinney later cleared the bases with a sacrifice ground out.

RIVERVIEW CLOSED the gap with a run in the third and three more in the fifth to make it 5-4, but Canton bounced back with five runs on six hits in the top half of the sixth.

De Bello walked, stole second, and McKinney drove him home with a double. Sobditch followed with a run-scor-

ing single, as did Matt Morrison, a draftee from Southfield. Tim Michalik, the big left-handed first baseman, and Richard Muller both knocked in runs to complete the inning.

For the game, Canton collected 14 hits.

Mark Bennett was the winning pitcher. He scattered six hits in five innings of work.

"We came out aggressive and ready to play," said Ebmeyer, whose team finished the year with a 22-4 record. "The kids came out here and wanted to make the best of this opportunity, and they did."

"I think that when we played so well in the McDonald's Invitational Tournament (Kingston, Ontario), that gave them a lot of confidence. I think that was the mental turning point."

McKINNEY LED the way for Canton with two hits and three RBIs. Moore finished the game with three hits for Craiger. Sobditch and Morrison collected two hits apiece.

In the semifinal, Craiger put on its finest hitting display this season, scoring six runs in the first inning, three in the third, seven in the fifth and five in the seventh.

Scott Ford got the win, throwing six innings of shutout baseball. Jim Dillon gave up all four Riverview runs in the bottom of the seventh.

Earl Skinner was knocked from the mound in the first inning. Three Riverview pitchers were used during the game, which would have been called after five innings but the 10-run mercy run was waived for the tournament competition.

"The teams didn't play up to the level of competition that we expected," said Ebmeyer. "After the first game (that Canton won in extra innings 7-6) the kids knew they could play with any team in the tournament."

"Had the game gone against us, I think it would have been very difficult to come back and win the tournament."

Prep football all-stars like game

Seventy-two high-school football players were getting their first real taste of what it felt like to be celebrities.

The East had just beaten the West, 6-3, in Saturday's First Annual Michigan High School East-West All-Star Football Game at Michigan State University's Spartan Stadium. Now many of the 12,000 spectators were pouring onto the field to seek autographs of the players and coaches.

"I've never done anything like this before," Birmingham Groves defensive back Ken Granader said with a big grin. "I feel kind of... dumb."

But Granader and his fellow football players were obviously honored by all the attention they were getting. These recent graduates had been part of a groundbreaking attempt to give Michigan what most other states have — a game in which to showcase the state's top prep football talent.

"We were in the first all-star game, and we were treated like all-stars," Granader said. "And I thought we played like all-stars."

Granader certainly did. The 5-foot-10, 180-pounder was a hero in the East win, being the team's leading tackler with 12 and stopping a tricky West running play with 40 seconds left in the game.

"The big thing was he had a game-saving tackle on their trick play," said Bill Comer, an administrator with the Michigan High School Football Coaches Association, the game's sponsor. "If he didn't make the play, their runner would have been able to pitch out to the tailback trailing behind him, and nobody would have been able to stop him."

"All the coaches were talking about it as the defensive play of the game."

THE WEST play was one of the three trick plays each team was allowed to keep secret from its opponent. While the West trick fizzled, the East's trick play dazzled.

With his team trailing 3-0 with about 1:20 left in the game, East quarterback Steve Coulter of Sterling Heights Stevenson pitched out to running back Steve Jones of Detroit Central. Jones surprised everybody by throwing the ball back to Coulter, who then threw the ball 79 yards to Temperance Bedford's Todd Stoner, who scored the game's only touchdown.

"Really the situation came where we were forced to do something, and we did it," said Al Fracassa, East head coach and head coach at Birmingham Brother Rice, of the desperation play. "Usually something like that coaches don't want to take a chance on early in the game. But after that worked, I thought why not use it early? Why save it so long? I guess it's just to give the fans an exciting finish."

Fracassa and his coaching staff had just seven days of practice to turn a loose assembly of players from throughout eastern Michigan into a team. The coach and his players were satisfied with the result.

"I thought we played as a team," said Granader, who will play for the University of Toledo this fall. "It wasn't just a lot of individuals out there. We stayed together real well. We've been pretty good friends since the second day of practice."

"Sometimes we stayed up to one, two in the morning, just talking," added Doug Ziegenbein, Granader's teammate on both East and Groves.

FOR ONE East player, Westland John Glenn linebacker Dale Boone, the game was a preview of things to come. Boone, who will play for Eastern Michigan University this fall, got to meet and play with future teammates like Coulter, punter Doug Schulte of North Farmington and linebacker Frank Simone of Trenton.

"At the beginning of the week, we were sort of individuals," Boone said of the East team. "As the week went on, everybody started to know each other. A lot of friendships were formed on that team that will last forever."

While not all the players got to work with future teammates, all got a chance to warm up for the upcoming college season.

"This is good thing, because we got practice wearing pads and playing under game conditions, so we got a jump on some of the other guys coming in," Granader said.

Both all-star teams squandered early scoring chances. The first half, in fact, was scoreless, and it was not until the third quarter, with 9:59 left, that somebody — the West — finally scored, on a field goal by North Muskegon's Mario Ferretti. That score held up into the game's final minutes.

"For some reason, I knew we could do it," Granader said. "With Stoner in there, you're never counted out."

"With Fracassa, there's always something that could happen," Ziegenbein added. "He told us to never let down."

The game did not draw the 20,000 fans that had been expected, but sponsors chalked that up partially to the bad weather.

The sponsors said, however, they are confident there will be a second annual all-star game.

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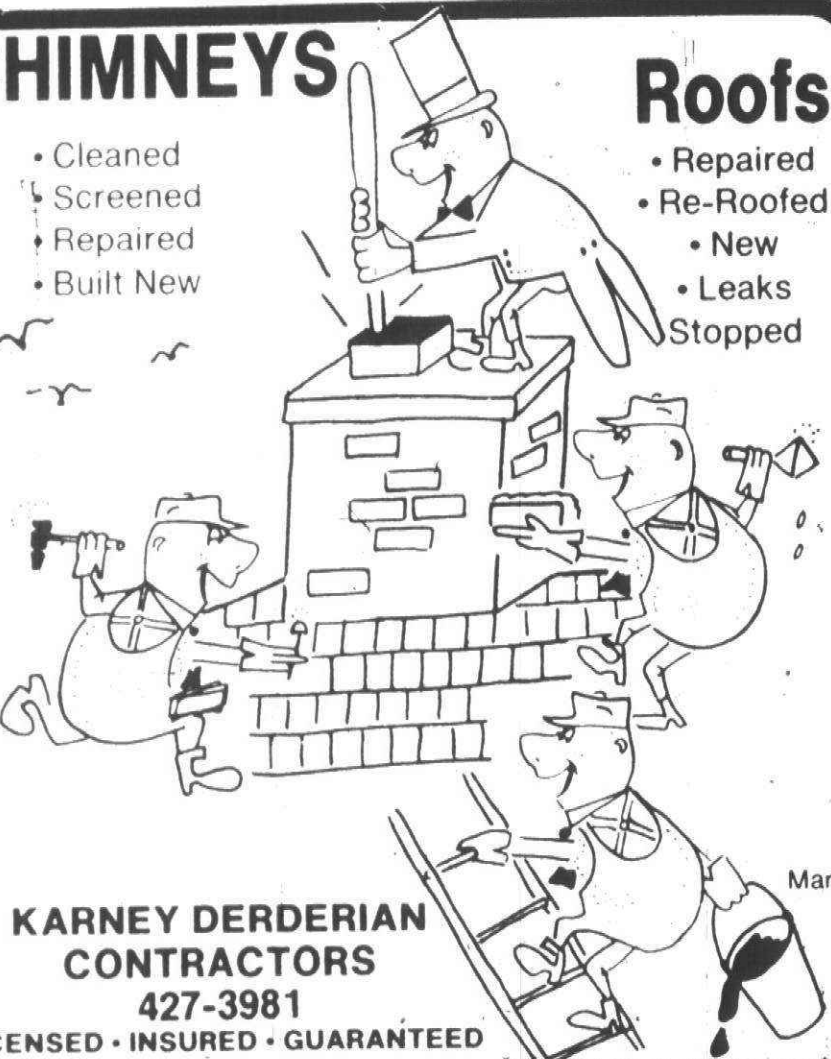

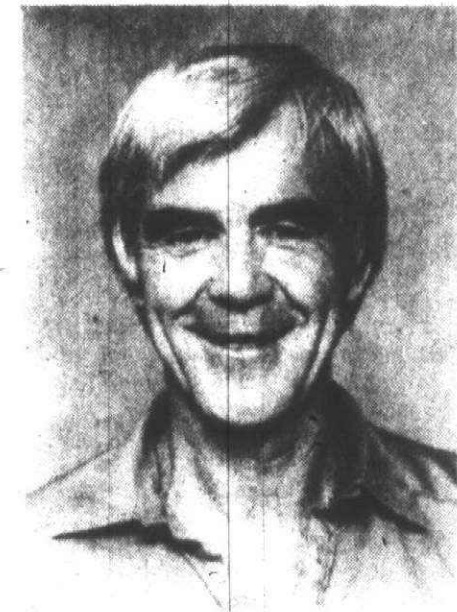

Niagara's falls are still stunning, but there's much more

NIAGARA FALLS, Ontario: First you hear it, a great thunder of foam-white water roaring over the falls at 15 million cubic feet a minute. Then you see the mist clouding wet and white above the canyon.

It doesn't matter how many times you have seen it before; it still teaches you anew the meaning of the word "awesome." And it may easily blot out the other things you can experience here along the Niagara River — old forts, Shaw Festival, wineries, parks.

Niagara Falls is so stunning that it's easy to say "I've been to the falls" and never go back. Don't do that. Get your raincoat on again, and ride the Maid of the Mist into the spray at the bottom of the great cataract.

Be a kid again, and stand at the terrifying edge of the Horseshoe Falls dreaming about the Indian maiden who, according to legend, was sent over the lip as a sacrifice every year.

THE TWO FALLS form the gleaming jeweled centerpiece in this bracelet of park and water that forms the Niagara Parkway for the entire 56 miles from Old Fort Erie on Lake Erie to the town of Niagara-on-the-Lake on Lake Ontario.

They are the reason that millions of tourists have come here every year since the War of 1812, but they are only two of the attractions along the Niagara River.

Most tourists catch the carnival that surrounds the falls but they miss the Canadian wine experience available at vineyards along the river, and the wonderful combination of Shaw Festival and historic town found at Niagara-on-the-Lake.

If you are interested in man-made amusements, there are three kinds in town: a tawdry carnival of wax museums up Clifton Street; the whale-and-porpoise show at Marineland, which draws more people than any attraction except the falls themselves; and two trend-setting shopping centers-cum-entertainment complexes called Pyramid Place and Maple Leaf Village.

THESE LAST two may indicate a new direction in corporate amusement centers.

Pyramid Place has three parts: a tasteful collection of restaurants and specialty shops in what was once a manufacturing building; an adjacent play area called Kids Place with 26 ingenious participatory play activities; and a pair of stunning films in the Imax theater, one of those giant screen experiences we first enjoyed at Expo '67 in Montreal.

Maple Leaf Village is a larger shopping center, with several in-the-mall amusement areas and the highest ferris wheel in North America set in an amusement park outside. The village is directly opposite the American Falls, in a prime location next to the Old Brock Sheraton hotel and above the sculpted gardens of Oakes Garden Theater.

If razzle-dazzle is not your scene, the gardens and the rest of the Niagara Parkway will show you what quality recreation is all about. Parks were established on both sides of the river in the late 19th century, to replace the carnival that had grown along the top of the bluff.

THE LAND ON the Canadian side of the Niagara River was settled by Pennsylvania Deutsch and other loyalists who fled the American Revolution. Drive half a mile south of the falls, through the garden glory of Queen Victoria Park, and you will see what the Niagara Parks Commission has done on the site of one of their early settlements, Bridgeport.

Little yellow paddle boats move gracefully around the tiny, tended Dufferin Islands. Swimmers make concentric circles in still pools, reminiscent in a quiet Ontario way of the famous Seven Pools of Maui in Hawaii.

Drive north of the falls, where the parkway runs flowered and green along the river to Lake Ontario, and you can stop at the Whirlpool Golf Club, the Niagara Glen Nature Area, the School of Horticulture, the 22,000 blossoms of the Niagara Flower Clock and Niagara-on-the-Lake.

Niagara-on-the-Lake celebrates its 200th birthday this year. It has always been a tourist center, but the establishment of the Shaw Festival in 1962 gave it new life as a meticulously restored and tended historic village.

A median of flowers points the road like a red geranium arrow past restored storefronts and the three theaters: Festival Theater, Old Court House Theater and Royal George, all of them busy at once.

DOWNHILL AT Queen's Royal Park, people cluster in T-shirted picnic groups on the green grass sloping to the

shore, where the Niagara flows into the lake. Sailboats and motorboats patch the water between this shore and the shape of Fort Niagara, beyond on the American side.

This is the same water, peaceful now, that thundered in great green foaming splendor over Niagara Falls,

around the whirlpool and down the gorge. A ferry runs daily from Niagara-on-the-Lake to Toronto.
