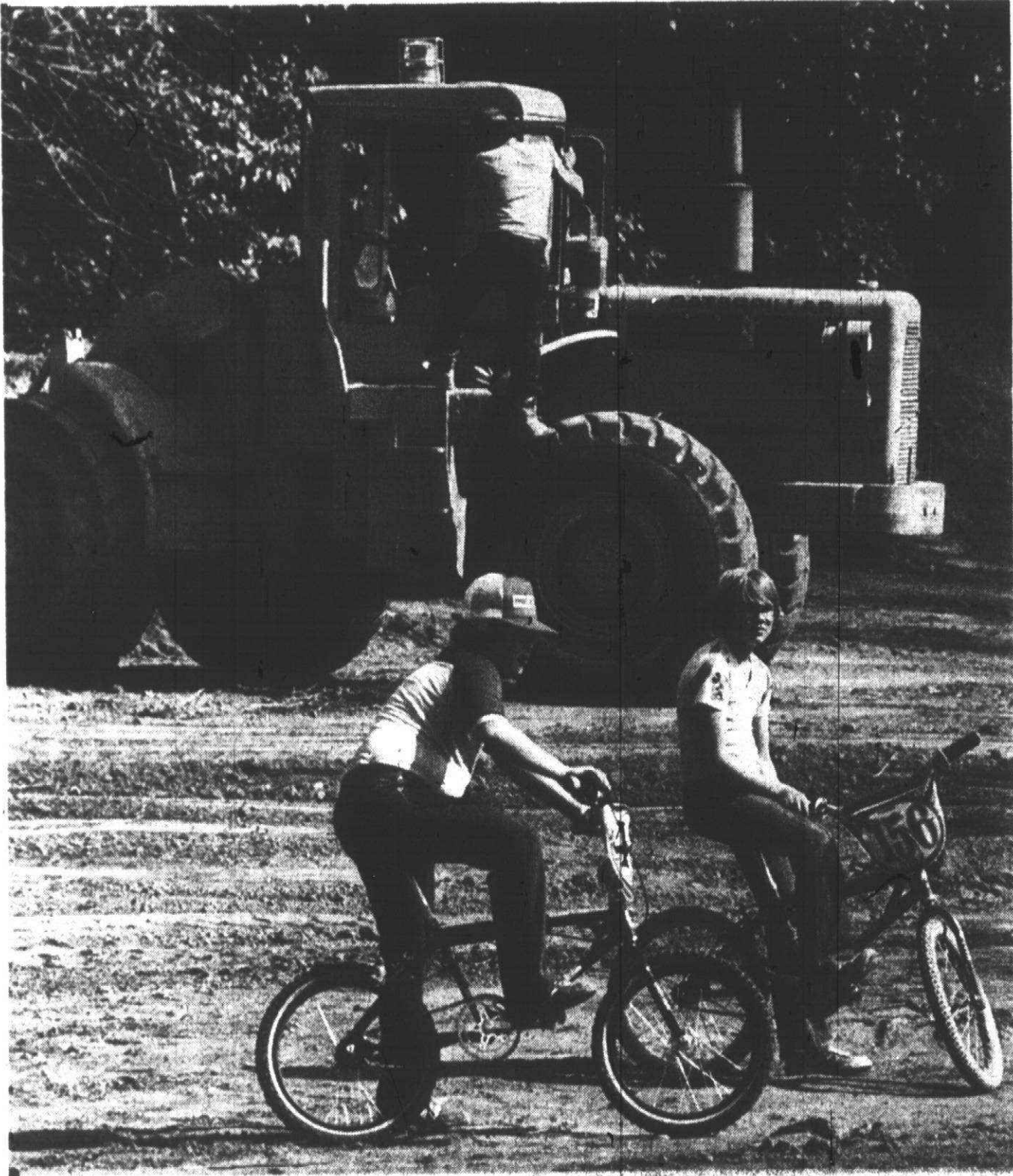

Schools reinstate some safety busing

It's amazing what can happen when a throng of 300 angry, and sometimes rude, parents voice a concern before a school board.

They usually get their way — at least that's true in the Plymouth-Canton community.

Amidst cries of recall, threats of personal liability to school-board members and a fair share of choice arguments and eye-opening obscenities, the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education reconsidered previous decisions to eliminate safety busing.

Monday's regular board of education meeting, which was shifted to the East Middle School cafeteria in anticipation of a big crowd, didn't begin until after 11 p.m., as parents used more than 3½ hours of the Citizen's Comment portion of the agenda to voice their concerns over elimination of a number of safety-busing trips, recommended by the safety committee.

Besides reversing decisions from last meeting, two weeks ago, the board also ignored three of the four safety-busing recommendations by the safety committee at this meeting.

When the dust settled, the board decided:

- To provide safety busing for students living in Holiday Park, Honeytree and Canton Gardens apartments attending Lowell Middle School for the first time. The 5-1 vote (Treasurer Glenn Schroeder dissenting) reversed the board's decision two weeks ago not to have safety busing for these students.

- Trustee Flossie Tonda, a Canton resident, was not present at this meeting.

- To provide safety busing in the Rocker Street area for students going to East Middle School. The 5-1 vote

(Schroeder dissenting) reversed the board's previous decision.

- To eliminate safety busing to Farrand Elementary School for students living east of Bradner and south of Five Mile, including Finch and Lakland Court (6-0 vote).

- To provide safety busing to West Middle Schools for students on Ridgewood, on the north side of N. Territorial and west of Sheldon (5-1 — Schroeder dissenting).

- To provide safety busing to Pioneer Middle School for the area west of Sheldon, east of Canton Center, south of Ann Arbor Road and north of Joy — the Mayflower subdivision (6-0 vote).

- To provide safety busing to Gallimore Elementary School for students living in an area south of the school, west of Sheldon and south of Warren, including Hampton Court subdivision (6-0 vote).

- To eliminate safety busing for students who have to cross Lilley to get to Field and Eriksson elementary schools unless traffic studies indicate crossing Lilley with the aid of a crossing guard would be unsafe. This decision was made at the last board meet and upheld Monday night.

CANTON POLICE are conducting a gap study to determine the safety for students going to Field and Eriksson.

As of Tuesday afternoon, John Hoben, school superintendent, said the students at Field and Eriksson will walk to school when school opens Monday.

Dale Goby, director of transportation and head of the safety committee, indicated the Field and Eriksson students will be bused, however, based on his discussions with the Canton Police.

Lt. Larry Stewart of the Canton Police told the Observer Tuesday that only one of the two gap studies were complete at that time.

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Sidewalks key decision

What started as a highly emotional plea for children's safety turned into an issue of sidewalks when the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education reversed many decisions on safety busing at Monday night's meeting.

The board, responding to more than 300 angry residents, ignored many recommendations made by the safety committee to eliminate safety busing for children living within 1½ miles of school — largely based on the lack of sidewalks.

Ironically, the lack of sidewalks was not a criterion given to the safety committee when they made their annual review of safety busing.

Jeanette Wines, a citizen who served on the 10-member safety committee, agreed with many of the board decisions to keep safety busing but was mad that sidewalks weren't considered in the original decision.

"Now, you're saying that you should use sidewalks as a criterion — you never gave us that," Ms. Wines told the board. "We were not allowed to look at that as a criterion. That's the only thing I, personally, am upset about."

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Police levy unchanged

Officials cut fire tax millage

Canton residents generally are satisfied with their fire protection, but they want to see more police cars patrolling subdivisions.

The Township Board Tuesday voted to keep the same millage rate of 3.25 mills for police service (\$3.25 per \$1,000 assessed property valuation), and to reduce the rate slightly for fire protection.

The vote came after a public hearing, in which about 10 residents made comments. Most complained about slow response on police calls for speeders, neighborhood disputes, noise, etc.

"Seldom, if ever, do we hear complaints about fire service," said Clerk John Flodin. "From the comments received, it's evident demands on (police) services demand as much money as we can give them."

The millage reduction will result in a revenue loss of \$47,000 for the fire department, said Finance Director Mike Gorman. Fire Chief Mel Paulun said the cut will come from contingency funds, and won't hurt fire protection.

IN EARLY SEPTEMBER, the board will set the general township operating budget for 1982, explained Finance Director Mike Gorman. If the operating millage stays the same — at 2.39 mills —

the average subdivision resident will pay about \$50 more in taxes for police, fire and township expenses. That figure is based on a home with a market value of \$77,000.

The increases will be reflected in tax bills sent out in December, according to Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz.

Township residents in 1976 and 1977 authorized the establishment of special assessments for police and fire protection. Under law, the Township Board may levy special assessments of up to 10 mills for each of those two services.

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Man charged in area murder

Ronald John Hartwig, 32, of Plymouth faces a preliminary examination on first-degree murder charges today in connection with the weekend bludgeoning death of Stacey Ann Hurrelbrink, 21, a long-time Plymouth resident.

Hartwig, ordered held without bond at his Monday arraignment, will appear before 35th District Court Judge Dunbar Davis.

Hartwig, barefoot and dressed in oversized blue Plymouth DPW coveralls, pleaded not guilty at the Monday arraignment. Maximum penalty on conviction is life imprisonment.

Earlier this week, attorney Arnold Shapero of Southfield, along with his partner Jack Bain, a one-time chief trial lawyer for the Oakland County Prosecutor's office, said they might represent Hartwig. Shapero said yesterday, however, that his firm won't take the case.

Hartwig, a one-year resident of the Old Village Inn at 886 Mill, was arrested by Plymouth Police Sunday morning less than 30 minutes after Ms. Hurrelbrink's partially-clad body was found concealed near

railroad tracks alongside the inn.

Hartwig was asleep in a car parked behind the inn when he was arrested at 6:25 a.m., said Plymouth Police Inspector Carl Berry.

Police arrived at the inn on a tip from a nearby Holbrook Street resident.

Berry said the tipster told police Hartwig confessed to the crime at her home Saturday night. She told police she accompanied Hartwig back to the inn and watched him and another woman hide the body in the brush.

According to neighbors in Old Village, Hartwig and Ms. Hurrelbrink were acquaintances but not close friends.

Police said Ms. Hurrelbrink, the mother of a 2-year-old daughter, did not have a permanent address and had planned to spend the night on a mattress in the basement of the inn.

Ms. Hurrelbrink's daughter is being cared for by relatives.

ACCORDING TO Darcelle Payne, an Old Village resident who lives near the inn, Ms. Hurrelbrink had stayed at her home "on and off" for several months. Ms. Payne said she told Stacey Saturday night that she had overstayed her welcome.

Crash into apartment moves Canton family

A Canton Township family is going to be living somewhere else for a couple of weeks until their Village Squire apartment is repaired.

Tammy Bressler, 17, was taking care of her 7-year-old brother Mark early Saturday while their mother, Dorcas Bressler, was out for the evening.

Tammy said Mark had asked her to keep him company in his room. That's where the two children were when Tammy heard a loud crash about 1:30 a.m.

She soon discovered that a car had crashed into the apartment, landing in her empty bedroom.

"IT WAS awful," said Tammy. "It smashed everything — my bed, my stereo and my albums."

"If I was in bed like I planned to be, I would have been badly hurt," she added. "The whole house was filled with carbon monoxide."

According to a police report, a car driven by a Livonia man had raced through the parking lot and over the curb in front of the Bressler apartment, on Sandhurst, near Ford and I-275. A spokesman for the Canton fire

department said the hole in the wall was large enough to walk through.

THE DRIVER, Christopher Trybus, 20, of Livonia was ticketed for reckless driving.

A fire department rescue unit took Trybus and his two passengers, Michael Kosanovich, 20, of Westland, and Kathleen Molter, 20, of Livonia, to Wayne County General Hospital.

Kosanovich was treated for his injuries and released. The other two declined treatment, according to the hospital.

AN EARLIER weekend traffic mishap in Canton resulted in more serious injuries.

According to a police report, Terry Joseph Monet, 28, of Ypsilanti, was driving the wrong way on westbound Michigan Avenue about 6:30 p.m. Friday. He collided head-on with a vehicle driven by Donald Deloyce Wood, 47, of Saline.

Both men were listed in poor condition in intensive care at Wayne County General Hospital Tuesday.

Canton police issued a ticket to Monet for driving the wrong way. Wood was issued a ticket for driving with a revoked license, according to police.

Angry parents persuade board

After seeing the completed gap study at Lilley and Saltz, Stewart said "that some type of protection is necessary" for students walking to school. He added that the preliminary indication on the other gap study, at Lilley and a creek area near Field, also will call for some type of safety measure.

SAFETY BUSING occurs when the school board allows students who live within 1.5 miles of school to be bused because of existing hazardous-walk areas en route to school. By state law, school districts do not have to provide busing for students living within 1.5 miles of the school building.

During the 3½ hour forum, before the board's new decisions, emotional parents voiced their concerns to board members.

Parents were worried about their children's safety walking to school — especially in the winter months when it's dark in the morning and dark early at night. Parents also said many walkways proposed by the safety committee are not "shoveled when snow falls in the winter, making it impossible for children to walk along the road."

Joyce Lopez, who lives in the Honeytree Apartments in Canton, insisted Joy was unsafe for her child to walk to school.

"I wouldn't even walk on that road — I'd be crazy," Ms. Lopez told the board. "And you're telling me that my kid has to walk on that road going against what I think."

"My child won't go to Lowell (if busing doesn't exist). I'll keep him home. You can take me to court."

Kathleen Hayden, of Majestic Ct., representing residents from the

Cherry Hill Orchards and Wagon Wheel West subdivisions had a petition from 135 persons opposing the elimination of safety busing to Field Elementary School.

"If anything happen to my children, I intend to hold members of the school board personally liable — not as a member of a school board, but each and everyone individually," Ms. Hayden said.

TRUSTEE TOM YACK, who initiated all the safety-bus recommendations, told the crowd he appreciated their concerns and said the board received valuable input on the safety-busing issue.

Yack defended the safety committee, saying the committee made recommendations "in all good conscience."

Marilyn Rickard, another citizen member of the safety committee, got into a shouting match with the crowd of parents, saying they "missed the point" in arguing with the school board. She called on the parents to pressure the local government municipalities for more sidewalks.

"I hope some of you will take your concerns to the township government," Ms. Rickard said.

CAROL DAVIS, the board president, agreed with Ms. Rickard.

"We're taking a lot of heat, but your township and your city should share in the heat," Ms. Davis said.

Dale Goby, director of transportation and head of the safety committee, has said local government units have "shirked" their responsibility for providing sidewalks — especially in Plymouth Township and Canton Township.

Goby, who took the brunt of the heat from parents, also was frustrated with the situation.

"I take my work very seriously, and, yes, it is frustrating," Goby said. "From a committee standpoint I can say the recommendations were made with a clear conscience."

"It really boils down to a matter of judgement on safety."

SAFETY BUSING occurs when the school board allows students living within 1.5 miles of school to be

bused because of the existence of hazardous areas en route to school.

By state law, school districts do not have to bus students living within 1.5 miles of their school building.

The criteria used to by the safety committee to determine safety busing included: grade level and age of students; adequacy of safe walking area; traffic conditions; bad weather conditions; and time of day.

It is the policy of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools to provide safety busing for students, kindergarten through second grade, who live one mile or more from their assigned school.

For each student bused who lives within 1.5 miles, the district loses \$24.31 in state reimbursement.

Excitement is opening day at Lowell

Exciting and hectic — that's the atmosphere at Hix, south of Joy, as James Russell Lowell Junior High School of Livonia is busy making the transition to Lowell Middle School of Plymouth-Canton.

Lowell officially opens as a Plymouth-Canton school for students grades six through nine on Wednesday. It's the start of Plymouth-Canton schools' five-year lease of the Livonia building.

Lowell was leased to the local school district last year to help cope with the enormous number of middle-school aged (grades five through nine) students in the district. Conversely, Livonia's experiencing a decline in student growth — making Lowell, the closest Livonia school building to Plymouth-Canton school-district boundaries, available for rent.

Gary Faber, an administrative area coordinator at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) for five years, was named the principal at Lowell last March and immediately began building his staff for the fall.

"WE HAVE A nice mixture of kids," Faber said. "We're receiving kids from all the schools except Central (Middle School). We're getting a healthy number from Pioneer, West and East (middle schools)."

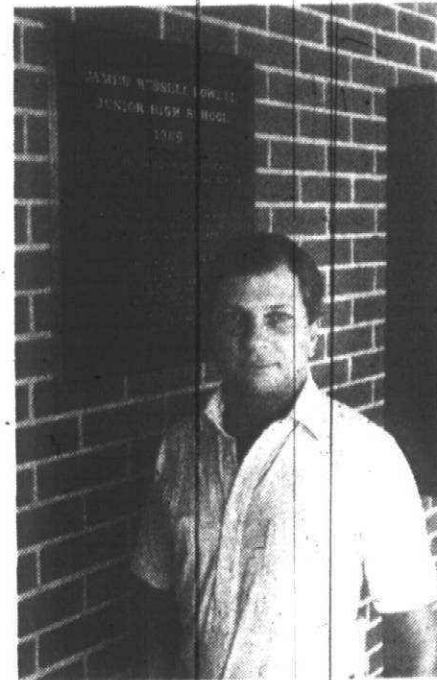
There will be 994 students attending Lowell, according to the latest count last week. Most of the students are from Canton Township, Eriksson and Fiegel elementary schools, along with some students from Tanger Elementary in Northville Township, will serve as feeder schools for Lowell.

The largest number of students at Lowell are sixth-graders, according to Faber. Ten of the 45-member faculty will teach sixth grade under self-contained (elementary-style) education.

Faber's staff is a mix of ninth-grade teachers from the Centennial Park and middle school teachers from Pioneer, West and East.

Teachers who worked at the ninth-grade level last year at the CEP were transferred to other schools when it was decided to move ninth grade from the high schools to the middle schools.

Faber said Plymouth-Canton schools took over the Lowell building July 1. By the Fourth of July weekend, volunteer teacher committees were formed in areas of "policy," "student advisory," and "faculty advisory."



Gary Faber, Lowell's principal, called it a dream come true to have the opportunity of opening a new school. Lowell is a Livonia school building which has been leased to Plymouth-Canton Community Schools for five years.

"They (the committees) set the groundwork for the start of the year," Faber said.

Faber added that two informational Parents' Nights were conducted in the spring and nearly 1,000 persons attended the orientations.

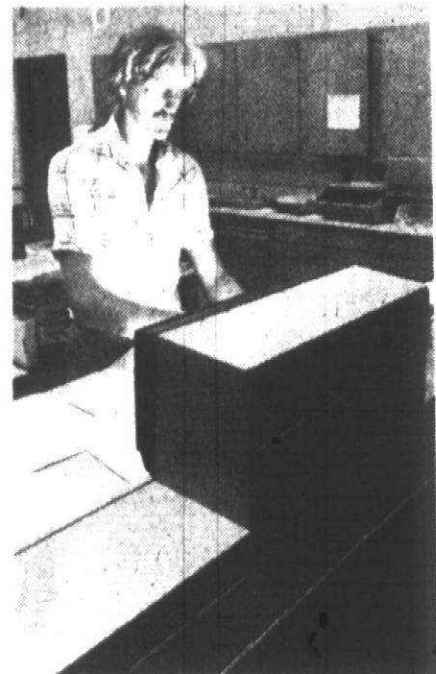
"We made as many efforts as possible to involve everyone," Faber said. "We didn't want to open up with just our thinking. We wanted to get everyone's input."

THE LONG range plan for Lowell still is unclear, but Faber said he assumes his school will continue to operate during the five-year lease before facing reevaluation of the need for a fifth middle school building.

For Faber, the position at Lowell is a dream come true. He began his teaching career at Holmes Junior High School in Livonia, teaching seventh-, eighth- and ninth-graders for five years.

"For me, it's like going home," Faber said. "It's something I've always wanted to do (being a principal). (But) I never dreamt the opportunity would be there to open a school."

From Holmes, Faber moved into administration, working in public relations for the Garden City schools. He also served as the assistant principal at Garden City East High School before coming to Plymouth-Canton five years ago.

Hold it! Old oil can be recycled

Do-it-yourself auto mechanics can save a few bucks by changing their own car oil.

But what does one do with the old, discarded oil? Pouring it into the street or a field — or even putting it in the trash — causes water pollution.

But environmental help is on the way. An area-wide governmental group is gearing up for a oil recycling program, in cooperation with local gas stations.

Under the plan, persons may take this discarded oil to certain stations for storage and eventual recycling for industrial use.

"PEOPLE change their oil quite often, and they don't know what to do with the old oil," said Marcie Colling, executive director of the Rouge River Watershed Council. "Until now, there wasn't anything for them to do with their oil which was good, environmental practice."

The Rouge River Watershed Council is a cooperative group of 19 municipalities within the Rouge watershed. (A watershed is a region which drains into a river system.)

Plymouth, Plymouth Township and Canton are voluntary members of the organization, which encourages good management practices concerning storm water and sewage disposal.

Ms. Colling said four million gallons of discarded oil is "lost," or put into the environment, each year in Wayne County alone.

ACCORDING TO Ms. Colling, the gas stations will store the oil in a drum. The discarded oil periodically will be sold for 15 to 25 cents a gallon, and hauled away for cleaning and filtering.

Eventually, the old motor oil can be used as an industrial lubricant or fuel.

The gas stations are taking part in the project "mostly as a public service," Ms. Colling said. "They aren't getting rich, by a long shot."

Local officials and interested citizens involved in the project have contacted a total of seven stations in the Plymouth-Canton community asking them to take part. They include:

- Doug's Plymouth Standard, Ann Arbor Trail and S. Main.
- Denver's Gulf Service, Starkweather and N. Main.
- McAllister's Service Station, Northville Road and Five Mile.
- Warren and Sheldon Mobil, Warren and Sheldon.
- Kmart, Ford and Sheldon.
- Mel's Auto Clinic, Ford Road west of Canton Center.
- Canton Shell, Haggerty and Ford.

The stations will have large, yellow signs in their window which state, "Oil Recycled Here," according to Cathy Prince, who is coordinating the effort in Canton. Mrs. Prince is a member of the Canton Township Waste Advisory Committee and the League of Women Voters.

Canton keeps some police millage, reduces fire

During the hearing, two residents complained that police are slow in responding to calls about noise and disruption from neighbors. Linda Lewis of Carriage Hills subdivision praised the police department on its handling of dog complaints.

Earl Simpson of Roundtable complained about auto traffic from nearby Palmer Road. "Somebody is going to

get it," she said.

Police Chief Jerry Cox said officers are fighting short staffing and a backlog of cases, which creates a "vicious circle."

"I fully appreciate that taxes are too high, and inflation is getting to everybody," said Cox.

Overall, property taxes in Canton are expected to be boosted by about 19 percent, due to inflation and changes in the state tax law. Taxes are computed

by a complicated formula, which includes property assessments, millage rates and a multiplying equalization factor.

Portions of taxes are allocated to school district, the township, Wayne County, Schoolcraft College, and others.

THE POLICE budget for 1982 is \$1.5 million. That will maintain the same level of services (32 sworn officers on

three shifts), and be covered by the 3.5 mills' assessment.

It was planned that the fire department millage rate would be 3.25 mills, to cover the original budget of \$1.6 million.

However, the board voted to trim that amount to 3.15 mills, resulting in a budget slash of \$47,000.

Trustee Robert Padgett voted no on the police-millage rate. He said he was trying to limit the overall expected tax

increases for homeowners.

Trustee Carol Bodenmiller voted no on the fire millage because she "doesn't like last-minute changes without another written proposal" to consult.

"Somewhere we have to hold the line," said Padgett.

"I would like to have a larger police force, but we can't do it overnight," he added.

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Dial-a-Ride bus rolls on—for now

A local dial-a-ride service for senior citizens and handicapped persons will roll on without change — at least for another 10 months.

That was apparently assured Tuesday when the Nankin Transit Commission (NTC) Board unanimously approved a service contract to continue service for Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, Wayne, and Inkster.

The board action to approve a contract with the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) through next June 30 puts an end to a

two week-long controversy about SEMTA taking over NTC.

Nankin Transit, which primarily serves senior citizens and handicapped persons seven days a week, was flooded with petitions signed by 1,800 patrons protesting the planned takeover by SEMTA.

But it is unclear whether NTC will continue after June 30 because of the regional transportation agency's goal of handling local bus services on its own instead of the current practice of contracting them out to suburban transit organizations, like NTC.

SEMTA discounted fears of local bus patrons that service would drop if the

regional agency took over NTC.

The petition drive was initiated nearly two weeks ago by drivers and employees of Nankin Transit.

They opposed the takeover because it may lead to a \$1 per hour drop in wages and reduction in fringe benefits.

BUS RIDERS in western Wayne County opposed the takeover for other reasons.

They said at a protest meeting last week that they like NTC's personalized services, such as bus drivers pulling into their driveways and helping in and out of the vehicles and aiding them with packages, if necessary.

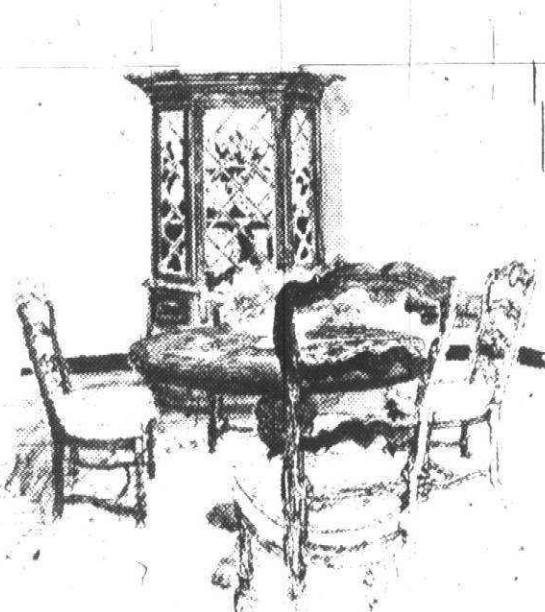
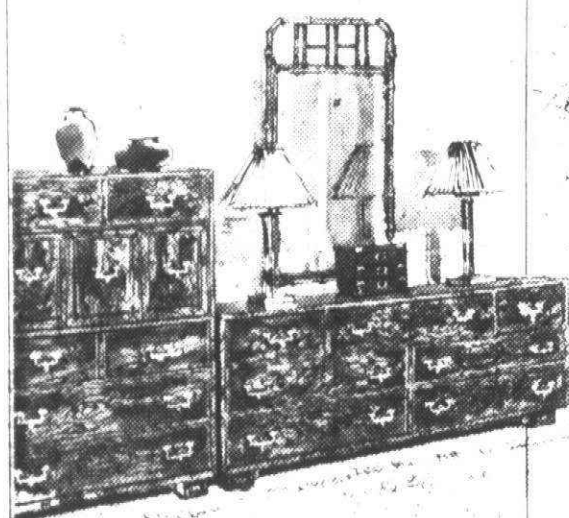
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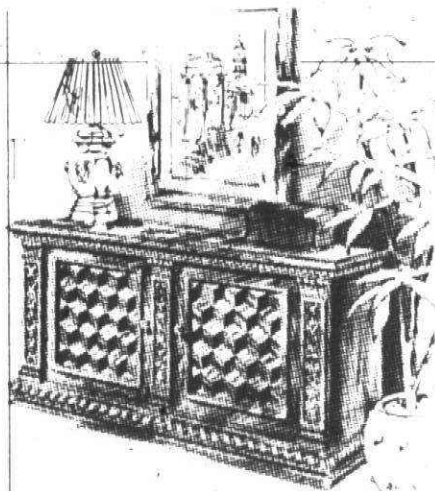
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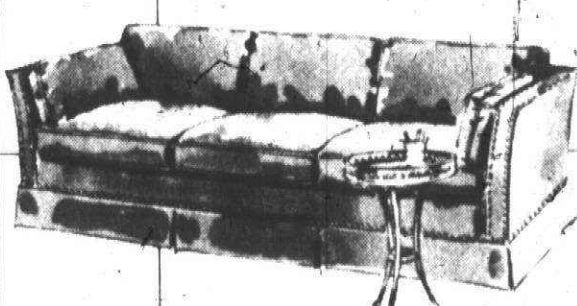
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Man charged with first-degree murder

Police said Ms. Hurrelbrink arrived at the inn sometime before midnight. They found her body, clad only in a white Mickey Mouse T-shirt, in bushes north of the C&O Railroad tracks between Holbrook and Mill streets shortly after 6 a.m.

Police theorize she died between 1 and 5 a.m. The Wayne County Medical Examiner's office said she died from multiple head injuries inflicted with a blunt instrument, possibly a claw hammer. Police had not found the murder weapon by Wednesday afternoon.

Police said the body was moved to the tracks from the inn's basement, where they found blood stains.

In addition to Hartwig, police also questioned an 18-year-old woman, a resident at the inn and a friend of Hartwig's.

She was released Monday morning. Inspector Berry said charges against her were still pending.

HARTWIG is believed to be unemployed, according to police and the

owner of the Old Village Inn, Eugene LeBlanc.

LeBlanc added, however, that Hartwig planned to begin classes this week in mechanics at Schoolcraft College. LeBlanc said Hartwig had a scholarship.

According to state Department of Corrections officials, Hartwig served time in prison on a car theft charge in 1969 and was released in 1972. During that time, he served an additional one-year sentence for prison escape.

LeBlanc said Hartwig lived at the Old Village Inn, formerly the Hotel Nelson, for about a year and had been a resident there two years ago.

"He was putting his life together and progressing quite well," LeBlanc said. "He's helped me out around here with miscellaneous painting."

Ms. Hurrelbrink was buried yesterday at the Rural Hills Cemetery in Northville, following services at the Casterline Funeral Home, Northville.

She completed her junior year at Plymouth Salem High School in 1977 then dropped out. School officials believe she had enrolled in an Ypsilanti adult education program in February 1981.

Pat Hann, an Old Village booster and merchant there, said Ms. Hurrelbrink cleaned homes and offices in the area. It's not known if that was her full-time employment.

Her mother, Glaeda Hurrelbrink of Ann Street, said she saw her daughter

only occasionally and didn't ask her many questions.

"She's been running scared from something for the last two months," said the mother. "From what, I don't know."

Mrs. Hann, a childhood neighbor, described Ms. Hurrelbrink as a "beautiful" woman who appeared to have gotten "mixed up with the wrong crowd."

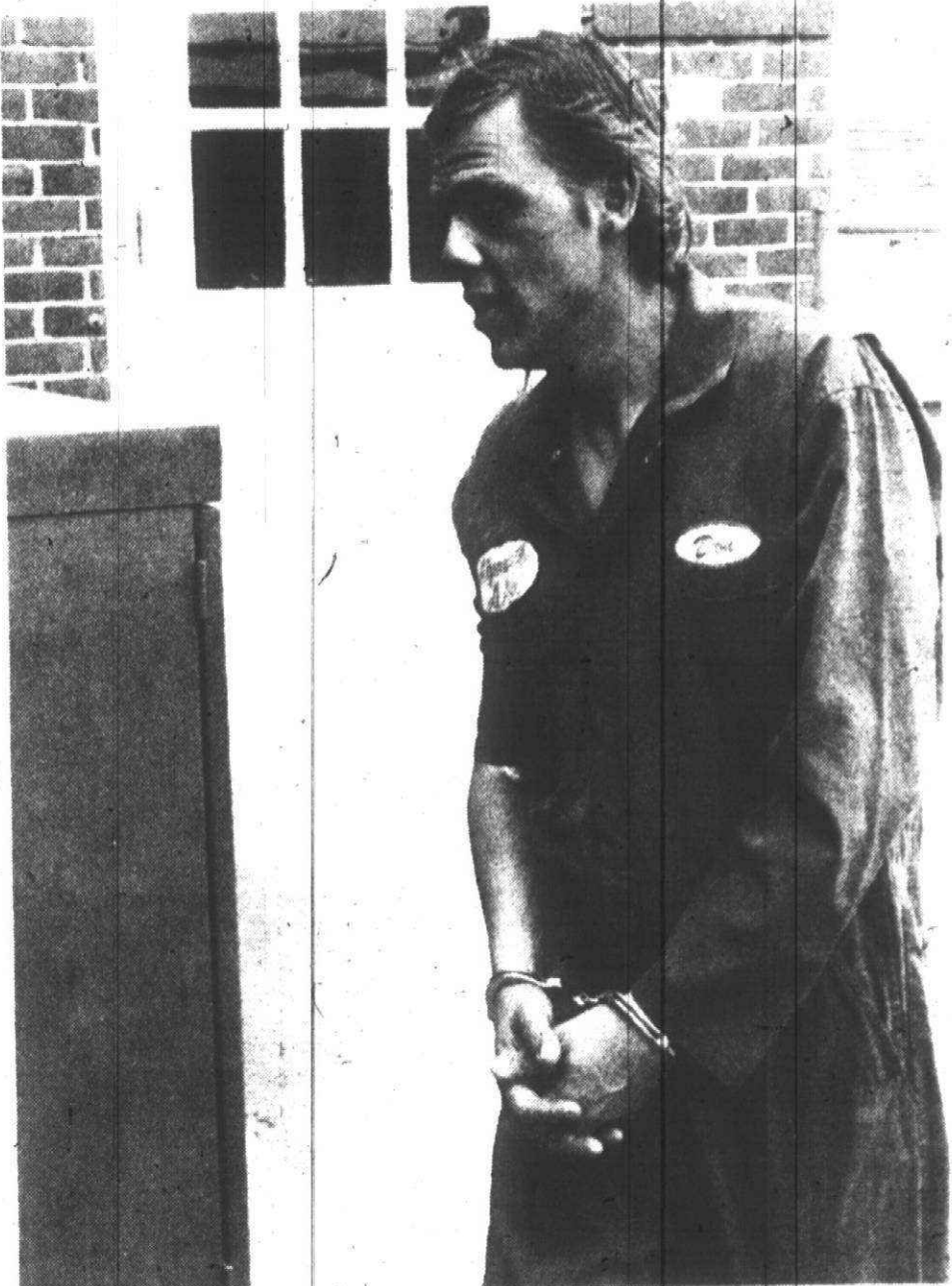
"Somewhere along the line, she got lost," Mrs. Hann said. "When I knew her (as a high school student), she was very easy-going. She talked of having a family and wanting to travel."

An Old Village resident said of Ms. Hurrelbrink's living arrangements recently: "No one ever knew where she was until she was here."

"She didn't have a home," Lt. Dan Carpenter said. "She was always looking for a place to stay. She was a mixed-up kid involved with some off-beat people."

"I don't know," Mrs. Hann added. "In this society, we've gotten a lot of them lost lately."

Ms. Hurrelbrink is survived by her parents, George and Glenda; her daughter, Krystal, 2; a brother, Scott, 17; and her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Nitzel of Northville and Mr. and Mrs. George Hurrelbrink of Clarion, Pa.

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Transportation funds sought

State tax package would increase driving costs

Because Michigan motorists have been buying less gasoline lately, there is a legislative move afoot to hike the state's tax take.

A complex package of bills has been introduced which would accomplish this, at some cost to motorists who would pay higher license plate fees, higher car sales taxes and probably more in state gasoline sales taxes.

The five-bill package has been introduced in the state House. It would increase license plate fees for most state motorists to \$28, peg the license fee in future years to income growth, hike taxes on car sales, and link state gasoline taxes to the price of fuel.

Area legislators surveyed by telephone agree the package is probably needed — but they also agree it's not likely to pass.

"I don't think they're politically achievable," said Senate Majority Leader William Faust, D-Westland.

Four of the five bills are tie-barred, meaning all must pass for any to take effect.

MOST MICHIGAN highway mainte-

nance money and millions in public transit funds come from the state gasoline sales tax of 11 cents for every gallon sold.

This has spurred the legislative move to keep the transportation network afloat. The package apparently would raise upwards of \$100-million-a-year more money.

The chief sponsor, state Rep. Mary Brown, D-Kalamazoo, estimates the package would mean a \$114-million more tax money during the next year if the wholesale price of gas were to rise 10 percent from \$1.10 a gallon.

Mrs. Brown said the statewide average wholesale price of gasoline now ranges between 98 cents and \$1.02 a gallon.

But a Sunoco spokesman said his company already wholesales its Detroit area best-seller, regular leaded gas, at \$1.123 a gallon.

An analyst for the House Taxation Committee, however, estimates the state will collect \$117 million more next year if the price of gas rises to \$1.13 a gallon from \$1.10. The sales tax would be 1½ cents higher at that price, the analyst said.

THE PACKAGE, introduced at the start of the current summer recess, offers a potential boon to highway lobbies, public transit agencies — especially SEMTA — and most villages and cities.

The Michigan Municipal League, an organization of cities and villages, is urging its member city councils to adopt a resolution of support.

BIGGEST CHANGE in the package appears to be a gas tax shift designed to offset tax losses when gasoline sales fall.

If you once drove a large car and filled it up every week with 20 gallons of gas, the state collected about \$2.20 in tax. If you now drive a subcompact and fill it up every week with 10 gallons of gas, the state collects only \$1.10.

The package would change the tax from a per-gallon basis, as it's now applied, to a tax based on 11 percent of the wholesale price of gasoline, with a minimum 11 cents a gallon tax.

Levying a percentage tax would tend to insulate the highway fund from tax losses if people use less gas in future years.

It also would mean an immediate tax increase of around a penny a gallon, based on the wholesale price of Sunoco gasoline in the Detroit area.

Rep. Brown called the gas tax measure "a shift in the base," adding, "at this point, it probably does not represent a real increase."

The House tax committee analyst, however, estimated that first-year tax increases would be \$51 million for car registration, \$53 million for gasoline

taxes — assuming gasoline rises three cents a gallon next year — and \$5 million in new taxes on diesel fuel. Car registration would be set at \$28 for nearly all private passenger vehicles under the bill.

Cities, SEMTA back tax bills, but dealers oppose the package

The five-bill tax package calling for more money from gasoline and car sales taxes and license plate fees has been endorsed by the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) and opposed by a group of 400 petroleum product distributors.

Also backing the package is the Michigan Municipal League and the Oakland County Road Commission.

The package would raise license plate fees for most state motorists to go to \$28, peg the license fee in future years to income growth, hike taxes on car sales, and link state gasoline taxes to the price of fuel.

The package is geared to raise funds for highway maintenance and public transportation. It calls for withdrawing from a flat 11 cents per gallon sales tax on gasoline and pegging the sales tax to the wholesale gas price. The

sales tax would equal 11 percent of the wholesale price.

THE MICHIGAN Petroleum Association, with a membership of 400 independent distributors, called the proposed move "highly inflationary."

Thomas G. Cordell, executive director, said, "There presently is a glut of gasoline on the market, and gasoline prices are comparatively low. When this glut disappears, prices are going to rise, no matter how distasteful that thought is." The oil group also objected to a tax increase as long as gasoline gets a five-cents tax break.

The SEMTA board of directors approved a resolution backing the plan. SEMTA agreed to join the Statewide Coalition for Balanced Transportation, a group of tax-plan backers.

ESTIMATES SAY the proposals would increase vehicle registration fees by about \$51 million every year, boost fuel taxes by about \$58 million (\$53 million of that in gasoline taxes and \$4.8 million in diesel taxes) and hike vehicle sales taxes by nearly \$8 million a year.

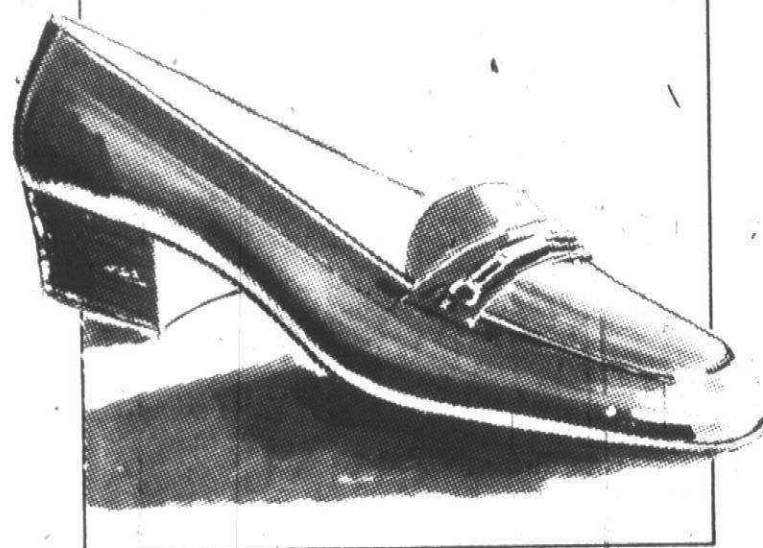
Bipartisan co-sponsors are Rep. Mary Brown, D-Kalamazoo, and Martin Butth, R-Rochester.

THE BILLS were introduced in response to complaints of many road agencies that new, fuel-efficient autos burn less gasoline and generate less taxes for roads.

If approved, the measures would increase funding for road maintenance to local units of government by about 15 percent next year.

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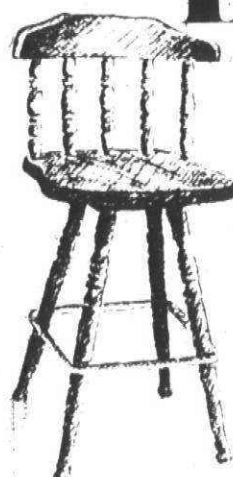
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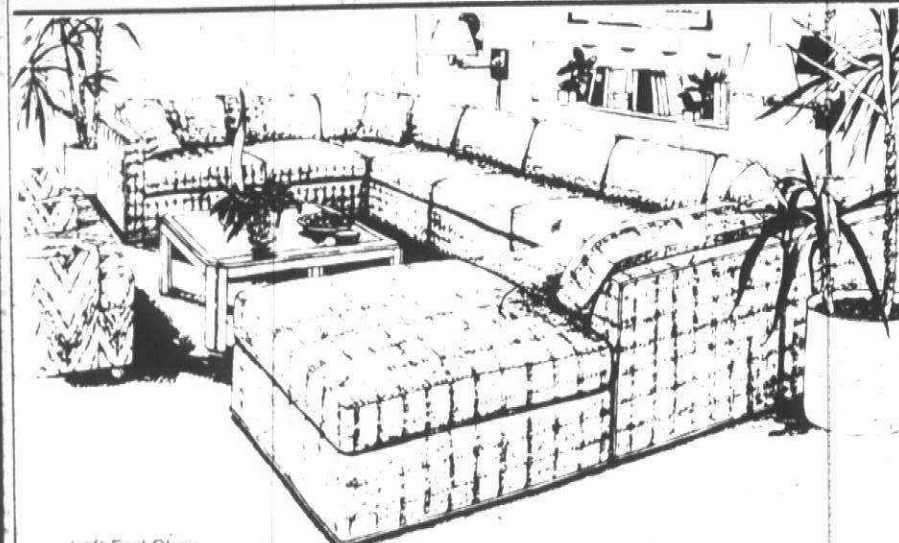

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Cooking habits affect energy use

The price of food is going up, but not as fast as the price of energy to prepare it.

You can attack the price increases three ways — by shopping better, by cooking less and by cooking more efficiently. The price increases make it increasingly important to learn to cook efficiently, as well as to shop wisely.

When using a range, a surprisingly large amount of energy is lost to the air. There are better ways to heat your house in the winter, and who needs the extra heat in the summer?

However, there are many ways you can avoid this waste.

Here are some range-top energy saving tips.

CHOOSING THE proper cookware is important. Select pots with tightly fitting covers to prevent the escape of heat.

Keep the pans tightly covered when possible so that the heat and moisture will be retained inside the pan while cooking.

People who boil water in an uncovered pot or kettle deserves the higher bills they pay. A teakettle is sensible.

Buy cookware made of heavy-gauge aluminum, which spreads the heat evenly to all cooking surfaces so that the food can cook uniformly. This makes efficient use of your cooking energy.

It is also important to choose pans with flat bottoms, which make better contact with the heat source. This reduction in energy loss is especially important if you have an electric range.

TO PREVENT waste, use the least amount of heat to perform a cooking job. Home economists recommend using medium to low heat.

Unless the room needs more humidity, there's no point in bringing anything to a rolling boil. Slightly boiling water is the same temperature as rapidly boiling water, and you'll use far less fuel. (Using a minimum amount of water will shorten your cooking time).

Frying should be done uncovered, using only enough heat to brown your food. High heat causes waste.

Place your pan on the cooking surface before turning on your range, making sure that you use the correct size pan to fit your burner.

THE SIZE OF the pan should also match the amount of food you are preparing. If the pan is too large, you will use more energy than you need. Why heat up a big pot if all you want is hot water for a cup of instant coffee?

If the pot you choose is too small for the job (or the heating element on an electric stove is too large, heat will flow up the side of the pot or pan and not do any cooking at all).

Buying a microwave oven just to save energy is silly, but microwave ovens have many other benefits. They're handy to have around. They can save a lot of energy, especially if you're in a hurry to thaw frozen food.

A microwave also is the most energy efficient way to heat water. It is the most energy efficient way to cook most foods.

LIKE THE microwave oven, the slow cooker won't pay for itself in energy savings, but it has other benefits. You can prepare supper in the morning, put the supper-to-be in a slow cooker, then ignore it.

When suppertime comes, you'll have a hot supper ready, properly cooked, without having spent a lot for energy.

The slow cooker is in a class by itself for stews and other foods that must be cooked slowly for several hours. For the energy cost of a light bulb, the slow cooker will prepare your supper.

Especially in the summer, you can cook less. When fresh vegetables are in season, a hearty salad can be prepared without using even the microwave. At any time of the year, you can make salads using sprouts. Sprouting uses no electrical or gas energy, other than that used to heat the hot water to clean your sprouting jar.

More research urged

Experiments key to food production

Basic scientific research, conducted by state experiment stations linked to universities, is the foundation on which the future in food production should be built, a former university educator believes.

Glen Salisbury, director emeritus of the University of Illinois Agricultural Experiment Station, told a conference group at Boyne Mountain that the "State Agricultural Experiment Station and its corollary for technology transfer to users is one of the great social inventions of all time. For animal agriculture, and many other segments of agriculture, it has been a world leader."

More than 200 scientists, educators, food producers and public policy makers met in Boyne Falls to debate and discuss the role of food and other products from animals in filling human needs in the 21st Century.

Ten groups, each made up of at least 20 conference participants, are working to establish research goals for animal agriculture during the next century. Their recommendations will be published by this fall and will be used to organize support and funding for the proposed research.

SALISBURY FOCUSED his speech on the part of state agricultural experiment stations in performing basic scientific research and solutions to problems faced by agriculture. He stressed the importance of the tie to land-grant schools, noting that the university environment provided agriculture with scientists "educated in the best of modern basic science."

However, agricultural research and the universities' experiment stations face a real dilemma which will continue into the future, Salisbury said. Both need more money to support their work, yet each may decide how to spend the funding in different — and conflicting — ways.

Young scientists at universities frequently can get caught in the fray, Salisbury said. "When they enter university employment they hear two

cadence. One is that of the internal promotion and rewards system." The other, he added, is the "cadence of service to agriculture."

But the two are not always the same and may not reflect similar values, or sometimes," Salisbury contended, "they relate only randomly."

"We produce young scientists who are right up to snuff in terms of basic science, but what they must do to maintain and promote their reputations, jobs and salaries often has 'very little to do with productive agriculture.'"

SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH, he emphasized, must stand as "the scouting party for ought to be done in food production for the future."

But scientists at state experiment stations cannot continue to provide leadership unless they can count on adequate funding from national and state governments.

"During that period of my life devoted to research management," Salisbury said, I soon learned that an agricultural experiment station has to concentrate on the sciences basic to its endowment and was something like a livestock feeding operation. It has a maintenance requirement just to keep it alive."

"It is only when an information-generating organism, which it is, has sustenance beyond its maintenance requirement that it can be productive."

In fact, said Salisbury, experiment stations are less productive than they have been in the past. And that will change only when the importance of their basic scientific work is recognized and supported.

"I interpret the recent fall-off in productivity of the station as society's failure to provide all of the necessary requirements to meet both its maintenance requirements and nutrients for production," he concluded.

"Clearly, if the state stations are to produce the evidence and multivariate and interacting human needs of the 21st Century, effective means must be found to finance the expanding research that the future demands."

Strawberry fields forever? Roy hums another tune

The strawberries are gone. The peas will be gone in about a week. The soybeans will go to Ohio in a couple of months.

Roy Schultz plans to retire after 35 years of farming off Lilley Road in Canton.

The 65-year-old started with chickens and sweet corn in 1946. In the '50s, it was milking cattle. The '60s brought beef cattle. In the '70s and into the '80s, it was pick-your-own strawberries and vegetables, which attracted throngs of area residents.

Roy has the looks and stature of a hard worker. His strong frame is the product of long years of grueling but productive work, as are the cracks in his deeply tanned hands.

THE SCHULTZ'S farm is 80 acres of "some of the best land in Wayne County," as Roy tells it. At one time, he had 300 acres, including the land Plymouth-Salem High School is on.

The farm is just south of Mettetal Airport. Planes taking off over the farm are a reminder of the encroach-

ing development that's slowly squeezing out farmers in Canton.

"I've watched five planes crash over the years," said Roy.

He has sold all but two acres and the house to Penz Development of Southfield. The land has been rezoned light industrial.

Roy's son-in-law, Dennis Wilkin, plans to rent the land from Penz and farm it until it is developed.

Joe Block of Penz predicts Wilkin will have a long career at the farm. He sees no development there until "Canton gets a tax base."

Roy began farming with his father on their farm in Dearborn and fondly recalls riding to the Eastern Market in Detroit with him on a horse drawn wagon at age 9.

FOR ROY, and his wife Tilly, some things have changed. He points to a tractor he bought in 1946 that's still in regular use.

As advancements in technology made farms more productive, Roy says "The public has benefited, (but) the farmer still just makes a living."

Roy's grandson, Mike McLennen, 13, was out in the field on a tractor plow-

the year 2000, U.S. farmers may have to cultivate an extra 85 to 140 million acres. Already the yield of one in every three acres harvested is shipped overseas, giving agricultural exports — some \$40 billion worth in 1980 — a big role in the national balance of trade.

IN THE MEANTIME, the land losses continue. The NALS says that if farmland conversion continues at the 1967-77 rate, Florida — producer of half the world's grapefruit and one-fourth the world's oranges — will lose nearly all its important farmland by the end of the century. California would lose 15 percent of its agricultural lands. Noting that citrus fruit, like many crops, depends on special micro-climates, Gray said, "If you lose those places you're not going to grow oranges in Kansas."

Changing population patterns have increased the pressure on farmland. The nation has more smaller families, and many of them are heading for a home in the country. "Over 40 percent of housing constructed during the 1970s was built in rural areas," the study reported, adding that 12 million new households are expected in non-metropolitan areas between 1977 and 1995.

As people move farther from city centers, they take up more space. Thomas J. Barlow of the Natural Resources Defense Council cited Minnesota's Twin Cities metropolitan region. The first million residents occupied about 180 square miles of land, but the second million took up an additional 550 square miles. When the area gets its third million, probably by 1990, they'll occupy an extra 1,600 square miles — almost 10 times as much land per capita as the first million. "The pattern applies to many cities," he said.

THE ARRIVAL of new residents in rural areas can set off a chain of events. The need arises for government services such as sewer, water, police and schools. The value of the land goes up, and often so do taxes. That can be decisive; farmers are finding themselves taxed out of their home counties.

Other conflicts can arise. People seeking the bucolic life and liveliness of the countryside will move right

Other efforts to protect farmland include voluntary agricultural districts; agricultural zoning, adopted by Hawaii and 270 local governments; the purchase or transfer of development rights on farmland; and comprehensive management plans.

alongside a farm, and all of a sudden they'll discover there are odors they never had in the city. Those people may file suit against the farmer or get local governments to restrict farming practices.

As farms disappear from an area, so do farm equipment and supply stores. Remaining farmers may fall into what the agricultural lands study calls the "impermanence syndrome" — seeing the approach of urbanization, they figure there's no long-range future in their farms and they stop practicing soil conservation or making needed repairs.

UNCLE SAM shares in the blame for the loss of farmland. The NALS named about 90 federal programs "that contribute to the conversion of agricultural land," prime among them are those run by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Farmers Home Administration and the Economic Development Administration. The study found that only two federal agencies — the Environmental Protection Agency and the USDA — have policies to consider the effect of their programs on farmland.

The study calls for a federal policy on agricultural lands and says that the government shouldn't help pay for development of good farmland but should offer incentives such as lower interest rates to encourage development elsewhere.

ing under picked over strawberry plants so soybeans could be planted the next day.

"He's only a little guy there, but when it's business time, he's a man," said Roy, adding that "every day you wait is one day off the growing season."

Roy is not optimistic about the future of farming in Canton, and says, "If there was a future in this, we would gladly turn it over," to his son-in-law.

HE CITES rising property taxes and the necessity of increasingly larger plots of land for the same return, due to the increase in productivity, as the

main causes behind local farmers getting out of the business. From 1946 to the present, Roy has seen his property taxes increase by 150 times. A bushel of corn doesn't buy what it used to, he says.

Roy looks forward to his free time.

He golfed in Florida during the winter months but never had a chance to play in the Detroit area because farming required so much of his time. "This isn't a business that you can do less. It's too confining," he said.

Roy and Tilly will travel some in their mobile home, enjoy their four married daughters and 10 grandchildren.

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Better business: Consumer tips to save you money

The joys of budgeting

Belt-tightening today — \$\$\$\$ goals tomorrow

Inflation has brought personal budgeting back into style.

For most families, staying even with today's spiraling costs requires paying some attention to how much money comes in and how it is spent. Getting ahead takes even more discipline.

Budgeting is especially important

for two-income families. When both spouses work, keeping track of finances is more complex. It is easier to overspend with more money available.

However, budgeting is important no matter what your lifestyle.

A GOOD BUDGET can help you spend your money on what you really

want, rather than frittering it away on incidentals. It can help prepare you for financial emergencies before they strike.

Thus, you aren't forced to borrow at perhaps onerous interest rates. In a nutshell, it can help give you financial control.

GOALS: Setting financial goals and developing a timetable for meeting them are essential steps in budgeting. Those goals — be they buying a new car, paying off state bills, building up an emergency savings fund, making additional investments — tell you what you are working toward.

Whatever your objectives are, write them down and how much you would like to save this year toward meeting them.

GROUND RULES: Your budget is the tool that will help you realize your objectives. An effective budget should be thorough, covering all expenditures no matter how small. It should be based on actual income and expenses, not estimates.

It is easier to work with a monthly budget, but you should calculate income and expenses from yearly totals so that you can save in advance for variable expenditures, such as higher winter heating bills, and periodic expenses, such as quarterly or semiannual insurance premiums. Just divide those totals by 12 to get monthly amounts.

To start your budget, gather up checkbooks, bills, receipts, tax returns;

bank books, dividend statements, pay stubs and other records for the past year. From that material, draw up two lists — one for your income and one for your expenses.

INCOME: [Income includes total take-home pay (salary minus all income and Social Security taxes and payroll deductions for savings, insurance and the like) plus interest, dividends, rents and other monies you receive.

Include bonuses and overtime pay only if you are fairly certain to get them over the next year.

EXPENSES: Divide your expense list into two categories — fixed and variable. Fixed expenses are the "have tos," obligations which must be met and which are often predictable. They include mortgage or rent, property taxes, heat and electricity, telephone, all insurance, debt repayment, tuition costs and your savings goal.

It is important to earmark the money you want to save for special goals as a fixed expense so that it is taken off the top before buying other things.

Variable expenses are those over which you have more control. They include food, gas and transportation, clothing and cleaning, entertainment, travel, medical care, household furnishings, gifts and pocket money. To make budgeting more bearable, try to allow some money for each family member to spend without accounting to anyone.

INFLATION: Unless you are reasonably sure your after-tax income will keep pace with inflation over the next year, you might want to include an inflation factor in your expense calculations.

For instance, if you assume your net income will rise 7 percent and inflation 10 percent, you could multiply expenses vulnerable to inflation by 3 percent before totaling expenditures. However, keep in mind that no one can predict the rate of inflation.

BOTTOM LINE: The bottom line is what remains after subtracting total fixed and variable expenses from total income. It is possible your new budget

will put you in the hole, especially if you plan to start saving regularly to meet financial goals. In that case, you will have to pare expenditures.

It is up to you to decide where to make those cutbacks because your budget must be based on your own priorities if it is to work, but variable expenses are usually the easiest to reduce.

Just remember, a little belt-tightening today, painful though it may be, can be worth it because of the future rewards it could bring.

Photo equipment: avoid the gimmicks

The array of equipment in a typical photography store can be bewildering and intimidating.

But take heart, says the Better Business Bureau, because coupled with knowledgeable advice from a salesperson, this variety is an asset that allows the buyer to find exactly the right device to fit existing needs and budget.

The would-be or experienced camera enthusiast should narrow down and examine photographic interests before attempting to buy equipment. Concentrating on price can prove costly.

Especially be wary of discounters who claim huge reductions off the "list price" or "suggested retail price" of expensive photo equipment.

WHAT THE AMATEUR photographer needs most is to find a well-informed, sympathetic dealer willing to explain the virtues and limitations of different types of equipment.

Look, too, for the availability of service after the sale, reliable warranties, repairs made on the premises, a wide stock of replacement parts and good advice on accessories.

Avoid the temptation to load up on unneeded options. A photographer, even a pro, shooting outdoors on sunny days who can keep subjects a prescribed distance from the lens opening, does not need sophisticated light control devices.

Cameras without any mechanical aid in focusing are capable of producing pictures that are just as sharp and accurate as those made by much more complex cameras.

LIKEWISE, the limitation of a fixed shutter opening can be overcome, to a large extent, by film selection, since both color and black-and-white film are available in all ranges of sensitivity to light.

It is not necessary, therefore, to buy the most expensive camera on the market to get desired results. In fact, fresh film can have a more dramatic impact on picture quality than the fine tuning of a light dial. Never skimp on film.

Consider carefully the features of any camera before buying it. Is it bulky or compact, heavy or light? Are lenses interchangeable among other cameras of the same type? Is the negative large enough to produce prints without the added expense on enlarging each frame?

Do built-in systems such as sophisticated light-control devices actually stifle the creativity of the serious photographer by limiting the speed of films that can be used?

Arrange to borrow or rent a potential camera — especially an expensive or complicated model — to test leisurely at home.

EXPERIENCED PHOTOGRAPHERS are divided on the advisability

or necessity of accessories. Some devices are just gimmicks. Others, like exposure meters, are valuable additions to the photographic arsenal.

In buying a meter, look for one that will operate across the entire light range of the camera and accommodate all types of film likely to be used.

If a gadget bag is desired, get one large enough to carry everything yet not so bulky as to be a burden.

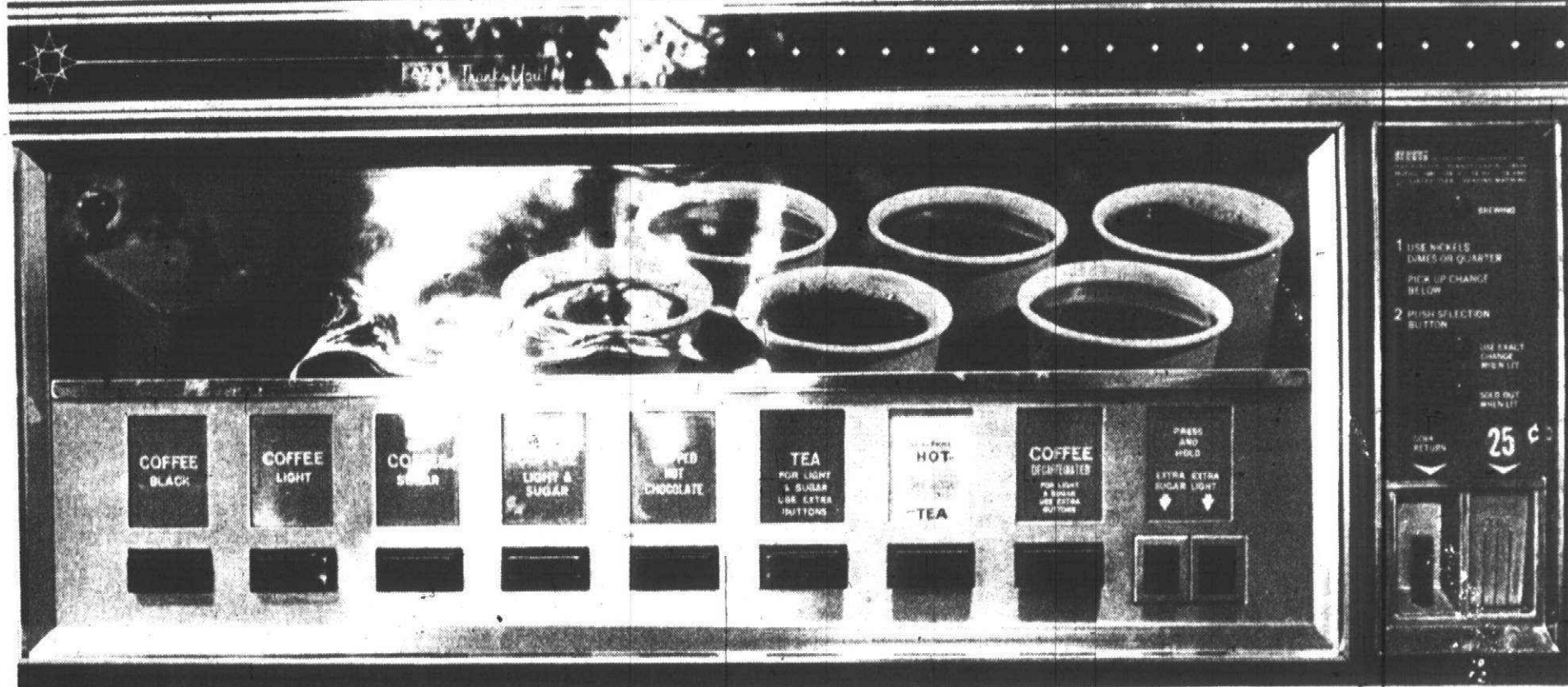
Adjustable compartments, small pockets to keep filters from getting lost in the bottom of the bag and a shoulder strap are desirable features.

In buying a flash unit, as opposed to a built-in flash mechanism, consider price, portability, whether it has an adjustable reflector and whether it can be used off the camera — by an extension cord — to create special effects.

SLIDE PROJECTORS range from the hand-held single slide viewer to fully automated models. Remote controls, editing and previewing devices and automatic focusing and leveling features are convenient but not essential.

Remember, the simpler the mechanism, the less likely it is to need repair. Be sure any electrical projector carries the Underwriters' Laboratory seal.

Try to get a statement in writing from the dealer providing for the replacement of any equipment that fails to function properly.



Vending-machine outfits: full of slugs

The lure is enticing: Work a few hours a week restocking strategically located vending machines and haul the profits away to the bank.

Ads for such part-time businesses are all too common.

For the most part, however, people who answer such ads in search of easy fortunes are doomed to failure, warns the Better Business Bureau.

In the first place, reputable vending machine manufacturers seldom advertise to recruit new entrants. And the prospective "distributor" or "route-

man" may discover only too late that the real purpose of the ad is to sell vending machines of dubious quality at grossly inflated prices.

WATCH OUT for the following:

- Poor equipment. A machine out of order not only misses the immediate sale but discourages customers from returning. Promoters of vending-machine schemes are long gone before the hapless owner discovers that the investment made is worthless.
- Fraud. High-pressure tactics of-

ten include promises of training, professional locators who will secure high-traffic locations for the machines, protected territories and even guarantees to buy back equipment if the owner is dissatisfied.

Even though many present vending company owners started their business originally with just a few machines, it is generally impossible to be trained as a successful vending operator in one or two weeks by a salesperson from out of town.

Legitimate vending machine manu-

facturers usually do not offer to locate machines for the purchaser. Such offers from manufacturers or distributors often are a tip-off that the promotion is suspect, or that the previous operator of the equipment has defaulted.

FURTHERMORE, established vending machine manufacturers usually do not assign territorial franchises or rights. In certain circumstances, territorial restrictions can be a violation of antitrust laws. The Federal Trade Commission and many states have, in recent years, regulated the sale of business opportunities.

It is wise to check with a local attorney and with state or federal authorities to determine how these laws affect the vending promotion being advertised.

• Obsolescence. In some instances, persons answering vending-machine ads have ended up with used, rebuilt or reconditioned equipment that may not accommodate technological changes.

In addition, some vending-machine offers are for machines which can accommodate only merchandise which is packaged in a special way. Rather than providing a competitive advantage, such a system limits the machine's owner from using other supplies or varying the products offered.

The prospective owner should ask how well a proposed product is selling now and whether it has successfully been vendied by machine in the past.

• Commissions. Generally, a vending machine operator has to pay a commission — a percentage of gross sales to the owner of the space where the machine is located.

The average professional vending operator nets only about five cents from every dollar of merchandise sold, before income taxes are deducted. Too-large commissions rapidly eat into profits. This forces cuts in service and profit quality and undermining the ability to build a reserve for expansion.

Mobile homes: not so mobile anymore

Mobile homes have changed dramatically since the 1950s and '60s.

Then, the predominant image of their occupants was that of transients — perhaps entertainers or seasonal laborers — living in a trailer on a vacant lot at the edge of town.

Today, many settled, young, married or retired people prefer to live in planned mobile home communities than in apartment or other forms of conventional housing.

The term "mobile" now refers only to the process of transporting the structure, in one or more sections, to the site of residence. Less than 3 percent of mobile homes are ever moved again.

The mobile home industry is beginning to use the word "modular" interchangeably with "mobile" to denote a residential building constructed at a factory and including the plumbing, heating and electrical systems.

LOW PRICE in comparison to conventional housing is the overwhelming attraction of mobile homes. This

form of housing now dominates the under-\$35,000 new-home market because of the economies possible through production on an assembly line.

Most new mobile homes are sold fully equipped with major appliances, furniture, draperies, lamps and carpeting and may contain such luxury features as air conditioning, trash compactors and central vacuuming systems.

Since the mobile home factory buys these furnishings in large quantities, the net cost to the new owner is significantly less than if he or she were to buy comparable furnishings at retail for a conventional residence.

Every mobile home built after June 15, 1976, must bear a seal indicating that it was built according to the National Mobile Home Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 established and enforced by the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

(Buyers of used mobile homes built before that date should look for com-

pliance with the Mobile Home Standard as established by the National Fire Protection Association and the American National Standards Institute.)

PROSPECTIVE BUYERS of mobile homes should be aware of several potential long-term disadvantages to the transaction:

- In contrast to conventional houses, whose value usually increases with the passage of time, mobile homes generally depreciate in value as they grow older.

- The placement and use of mobile homes depends on greatly differing local zoning regulations, many of which severely limit a mobile home-owner's choice of neighborhoods.

- The purchase price of the home typically does not include purchase or rental of land. Thus a significant cost factor must be reckoned with separately. Potential mobile home buyers should negotiate a long-term lease if rental of a parcel of land is the preferred course, before committing

themselves to buying the structure.

- Finance charges on mobile home loans are likely to be higher than those for conventional housing.

THE BETTER Business Bureau urges particular attention to financial details in a mobile home purchase. All financial institutions can make mobile home loans, either directly or through the retail dealer.

The most common method of financing is through a chattel (personal property) mortgage loan.

Down payments range from none, under Veterans Administration regulations, to 25 percent or more. Keep in mind that although mobile home dealers, like automobile dealers, arrange convenient financing and insurance as part of the sales package, the potential buyer would be wise to check numerous sources of money.

The Better Business Bureau suggests that prospective buyers also check with the Federal Housing Administration to see if they qualify for government-insured loans.

What do travel writers do when they get together? Talk about travel, just like you do, reliving the great times and the disasters, savoring great discoveries.

My friend and professional associate, Yvette Cardozo of Miami, who writes about tap taps on this page today, remembers very well the first time she heard about these colorful painted Haitian "taxis."

"A couple of friends who run a Haitian scuba-diving shop decided to go native, taking tap taps regularly for the one-hour ride from their home to Port au Prince."

"They changed their minds the day the tap tap arrived with 31 live goats on the roof. The goats had been pretty thirsty before leaving. They tanked up. And there was a stiff breeze."

"That was the day our friends bought a car."

SOMETIMES WHAT you talk about are secret discoveries, like the one that Nancy Kennedy of Ford Times magazine made one day in Chicago. I can't claim any credit of this little travel treasure. I just followed along, sure that Nancy would find us a great restaurant. She did.

Le Chateau is a new restaurant, with an adjacent bakery, at 41 E. Superior, a few long blocks from the Water Tower. Nancy and her mother had stumbled upon the bakery on a previous trip, before the restaurant itself was open, but she couldn't find any Chicagoan with inside information about it so we went to check it out for ourselves.

America is full of pseudo-sophisticated restaurants, where flounder disguised as sole floats in an unknown sauce. So it is a special pleasure to walk into the simple elegance of this restaurant, which is owned and managed by Swiss Air Lines.

The dark wood and white walls, the glister of the pastry table, the quiet attentive waiters in their black suits — excuse me while I rhapsodize. The food was wonderful. The wine was wonderful. USUALLY I swap stories with other travelers one-to-one over a barbecue or a drink, but sometimes there is a larger audience. I swapped tales for a full hour last week as the guest on a radio travel show called "Around the World in 60 Minutes," which is broadcast 8-9 a.m. Fridays on WCAR-AM (1090).

The tap taps

Amid the tropics of Haiti, art cruises by on 4 wheels

AMONG THE few adventures left in this semi-civilized world is a ride on a Haitian tap tap.

A tap tap is Haiti's answer to Greyhound, but it's more than just a bus. It is a palette for budding Haitian artists and a slice of Haitian life.

During my recent trip to Haiti, I decided a tap tap would not only get me cheaply from Cap Haitien to Port au Prince, but also would spare me the usual tourist traps.

It was 7 a.m. when my friend and I found ourselves standing with our luggage in the middle of a muddy street in Cap Haitien on Haiti's north coast.

Along the curb stood half a dozen standard vans and small flatbed trucks of indeterminate vintage, their parentages long ago blurred by mud and potholes.

Upon the flatbeds, each driver had painstakingly hammered a rectangle of wood, furnished with crude, thinly padded benches. A few of the newer ones had standard van seats.

WE CHOSE a vehicle that was slightly shinier than the rest, a Toyota pickup whose driver wanted \$4 apiece for the trip.

We were apprehensive about letting go of our luggage until we saw the stiff-legged fellow with folded arms standing on the roof. One look at his face and we decided nobody was going to mess with the luggage. Rooftop guards are standard practice here.

What makes these little buses stand out is the artwork upon their sides. Tap taps are like fingerprints; no two are alike.

Ours was a profusion of hot, strong color — fiery reds, deep purples, bright yellows. There were curtains painted on the windshield. The hupcaps were a primary swirl of red, yellow and blue. Upon each front door was a portrait of Moses, eyes blazing, with the 10 Commandments in his arms. The sides of the pickup bore scenes from the Haitian countryside.

The back end showed some kind of disaster — people stumbling through the turbid waters of a river and crawling up the banks.

The artwork was primitive but showed real talent on tap taps. Few tap tap owners these days do their own designs. It's become almost a specialty.

The buses all have names. Ours was "Lange du Ciel" — Angel of the Sky. One was called Deliverance, another was Discipline, and a third was Bath Sheba. My favorite was Shad Rack.

IT IS SAID tap taps began appearing just after World War II. They've always been rattetaps, barely sputtering along on faith. Hence the name "tap tap." Supposedly, that's after the sound of their vintage engines. "Tap tap" is also local slang for hurry up, so the choice of origins is hazy.

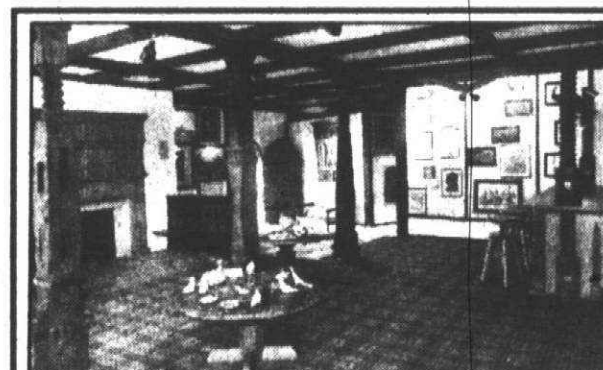
We were told it was to be a five-hour ride. Why then, I wondered, did one woman come equipped with food for two days — and a flashlight?

There are some tricks to riding tap taps. Pay the driver more and he'll let you sit up front, where it is cooler and more comfortable. If you've already missed the choice perch, buy two seats in back. With luck, you'll wind up with space for one and a half.

Remember the car stuffing contests of the 1950s? Add a couple of chickens, a goat or two and some errant furni-



Haitian artist Alix Beaujour (left) decorated the van in the style of Haitian "tap taps."



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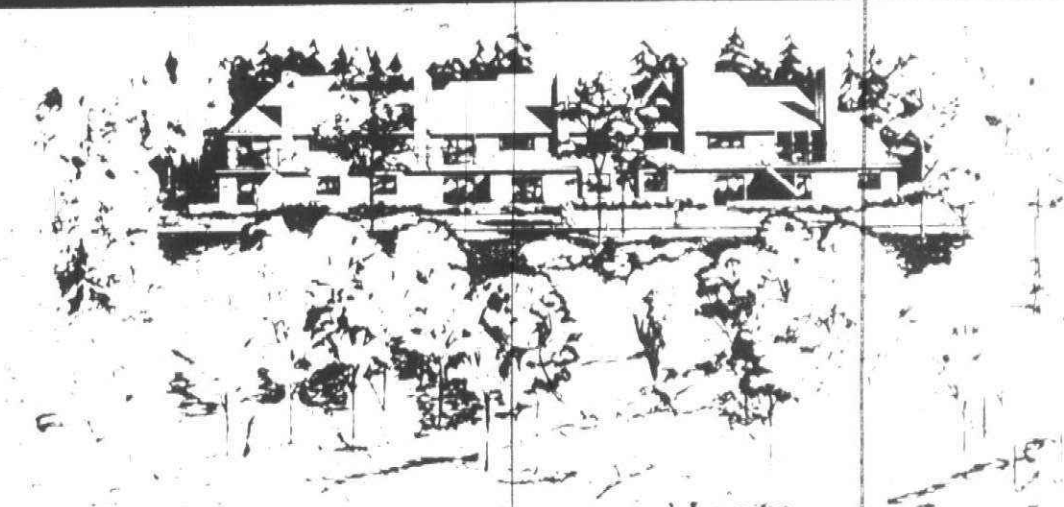

ture on the roof. Then paint it like an Easter egg and you've got the picture of your average tap tap.

At the city gates, a uniformed policeman stopped the bus and asked us something. Since we speak neither French nor the locally-brewed Creole, we never did find out what he wanted. But he seemed satisfied when we pulled out our pink tourist cards. Except for that one spot, police along the road did nothing more than wave.

Suddenly, an unfinished bridge loomed into view. Without breaking speed, our little truck rumbled down the bank and sank floorboard deep into the water. Several hundred yards later, we lunged up the other bank and went on our way.

AS THE MILES UNFOLDED, so did the face of rural Haiti. The land is a curious mixture of lush tropics and parched desert. Mud-walled huts were roofed with palm thatch. Mango trees grew between the houses; lines of well-trained cactus took the place of fences.

At the roadside, in the shade of trees, sat women and children near mats piled high with mangoes. Besides them stood gallon jars of light-brown paste. It was peanut butter — Haitian style with lots of spice.

People along the road shouted. Others waved. When we stopped scant minutes in tiny crossroad towns, friends passed packages to riders. Riders passed packages to friends. And sellers with fruit or bright pink soda pop hovered around the windows.

The streets were lined with piles of wares for sale — row upon row of plastic sandals, straw hats, silverware, enamel pots. Corn dried in the sun.

Among the crush of goods and people, a few stood out: a little girl with her head held high beneath a giant basket of charcoal, a wrinkled old woman huddled over piles of bread, a stringy-armed man with a freshly killed pig on his back, trying to maneuver his load through the crowd.

All too soon, we would start and the town was behind us.

Sometimes we would overtake another tap tap. Could we pass on the narrow mountain roads? The drivers were

very careful, understandable when one considers that the tap tap driver is also owner. He is jockeying his life's investment through a country where the average annual wage is \$130.

BEYOND THE FIRST CROP of mountains south of Cap Haitien, the land turns to dust. The bananas and papaya, the lush greenness and red clay soil give way to cream sand and cactus

trees whose fuzzy trunks are topped with spine-studded plates for leaves. Vast forests of these strange trees line the roads. The scrubby mountains look like the American southwest.

The desert is broken often by unexpected green, by a vestpocket rain forest or a couple square miles of rice paddies.

Eventually, we broke through the

last mountain pass and came back down to the sea. The mud-walled huts drew closer and closer together. There was a brick-walled building. Then two. And finally, we plunged back into urban life at the outskirts of Port au Prince.

This was not our first tap tap ride in Haiti. Like everybody else around, we took to hopping them for the 30-mile

trip from our resort to town. We learned, the hard way, that it's best to use paper money. American quarters — though worth one and a half paper gourds — are exactly the size and feel of a Haitian coin worth pennies.

There are far kinder things to do to one's body then spend half a day in a tap tap. But it would be a shame to miss the adventure.

Remember the car stuffing contests of the 1950s? Add a couple of chickens, a goat or two and some errant furniture on the roof. Then paint it like an Easter egg and you've got the picture of your average tap tap.

Public transit would gain about \$8 million a year in new revenues next year under the measure through redefinitions of the share of total gas and weight taxes and through a staged, increasing share of sales taxes paid on auto-related goods.

REP. BROWN predicts passage for

the measures.

"I think it has to pass this session. It's just a question of whether we get it through in the next month and a half. I'd like it to get to the senate by the 15th of October."

"We have to have that bill through by the first of November if it's going to be effective for next year's plates," Rep. Brown continued.

"The only way it'll have a chance," she continued, "is if we have the support not only of the interest groups — which we do have — but the support of the governor and the (legislative) leadership. Now I think that'll all come together. It's a matter of timing," she said.

SEN. FAUST, a key member of that

legislative leadership, is less optimistic about the package's chances.

"The fact that we're going to cut on one side — hopefully — and raise taxes on the other? I just think that creates a dichotomy that's too much for (the tax bills) to take," said Faust.

The legislature is expected to enact some kind of property tax reduction measure when sessions resume in the fall.

One bill would change the way gas tax revenues are funneled to SEMTA, resulting in more than half of all the taxes collected statewide for public transportation being allocated to SEMTA.

That provision of the package would also cause millions of dollars in revenues collected under special tri-county license plate and title

transfer taxes to be delivered to SEMTA. The money is currently held in escrow under a March court order.

REVENUES for road construction and repair (and public transportation have declined since early last year, when rapidly rising fuel costs and more fuel-efficient cars resulted in the sale of less gasoline.

SCC readies new tabloid

Suburban Communications Corp., a Livonia-based publisher of 41 community newspapers, has entered into an agreement with the Renaissance Center Partnership to begin a new tabloid about downtown Detroit.

The first issue will be published on Oct. 20 and be called "The Renaissance Scene," replacing a monthly newsletter by the same name that has promoted Renaissance Center events since 1978.

The new publication will be biweekly with a 24-page magazine format. It will have a large, easy-to-read type, bold design and emphasize photography. It will also include retail and classified advertising.

"The publication's objective will be broader than that of the newsletter," said Richard Aginian, president of Suburban Communications Corp. "We will focus not only on activities at Renaissance Center, but we will provide information about events, services and people of interest to employees in, and visitors to, downtown Detroit."

"We intend to tell these stories through the eyes of people working and serving the Renaissance Center and the downtown area, and to tell how their efforts are helping create Detroit's renaissance."

Wayne S. Doran, president of Detroit Downtown Development Corp., said, "We are pleased to have an organization with the community expertise of

Suburban Communications Corp. handling the Renaissance Scene.

Aginian added, "We see this as a business opportunity to draw upon and extend our management experience in the community newspaper field. As the cities of America rebuild themselves, new definitions of community are being created. It is our opinion that the Renaissance Center development has created a new type of urban community with special needs for communication."

The initial press run of the new tabloid will be 20,000 copies. Complimentary copies will be distributed to all Renaissance Center office tenants. Detroit Plaza Hotel guests will be given a complimentary copy as they register. Additional copies will be made available in the Detroit Plaza Hotel elevator lobbies. With the occupancy of two new 19-story office towers and additional retail space now under construction, distribution will be expanded.

Suburban Communications Corp. will open a Renaissance Center office in Suite 1700 of Tower 200 and announce its staff for the new publication in September.

The corporation publishes 30 community newspapers in southeastern Michigan and 11 in the Cincinnati area. It also publishes the Farmer's Advance for the agricultural community in Michigan, Indiana and Ohio.

Here's how area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes before the summer recess.

HOUSE

SAVINGS BONDS — The House rejected, 182 for and 233 against, an amendment to prohibit the Treasury Department from promoting the sale of U.S. Savings Bonds. The vote occurred during debate on a FY 1982 appropriations bill (HR 4121) later passed and sent to the Senate. The amendment sought to delete \$13.6 million earmarked for bond promotion.

Supporter Forney Stark, D-Calif., said: "We are offering 8 percent in the name of patriotism. . . Why should we ask the poorest of the poor to take 8 percent? We are offering major corporations 10, 15 percent, on Treasury bills."

Opponent Carroll Campbell, R-S.C., said passage of the amendment would "wipe something out in the name of fiscal austerity that in fact is a vehicle for many Americans to save."

Members voting "yea" wanted to ban promotion of U.S. Savings Bonds on grounds that low interest yield makes them a bad investment.

Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor, voted "yea."
Reps. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, David Bonior, D-Mt. Clemens, William Brodhead, D-Detroit, James Blanchard, D-Pleasant Ridge, William Broomfield, R-Birm., voted "nay."

TENNESSEE-TOMBIGBEE — By a vote of 198 for and 208 against, the House rejected an amendment to deny an additional \$189 million for the Tennessee-Tombigbee waterway, estimated to cost nearly \$2 billion. The project, largest ever undertaken by the Army Corps of Engineers, is a 232-mile waterway connecting the Tennessee and Tombigbee rivers to provide a route for barges from the Appalachian

coal fields to the Mississippi River and the Gulf of Mexico. About \$1.5 billion already has been appropriated. The amendment was offered to an appropriations bill (HR4144) later passed and sent to the Senate.

Rep. Jim Leach, R-Iowa, a supporter of terminating the project, called it a "monument to the extravagance of the congressional pork barrel."

Rep. David Bowen, D-Miss., an opponent of eliminating the funding, said: "It would be an environmental disaster if we tried to stop the project now. We would have the longest swamp in America."

Members voting "yea" opposed the Tennessee-Tombigbee project.
Pursell, Bonior, Brodhead, Blanchard, Broomfield voted "yea."
Ford and Albosta voted "nay."

PRIVATE SCHOOLS — The House adopted, 337 for and 83 against, an amendment depriving the Internal Revenue Service of money to enforce regulations that deny tax-exempt status to private schools discriminating against minorities. A federal judge has approved IRS affirmative action regulations for private schools in Mississippi, and the policy may be extended nationwide. The vote came during debate on an appropriations bill (HR 4121) later passed and sent to the Senate.

Sponsor John Ashbrook, R-Ohio, said:

"Liberal activists want racial quotas enforced in America's private schools, and they are looking for a way, any way, to get them imposed."

Opponent Millicent Fenwick, R-N.J., said: "We know that there are schools that have been set up deliberately in defiance of the law designed to end segregation and to give an equal opportunity for education to all children."

Members voting "yea" opposed using IRS tax-exemption regulations to integrate private schools.

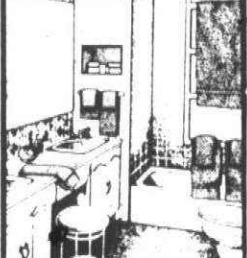

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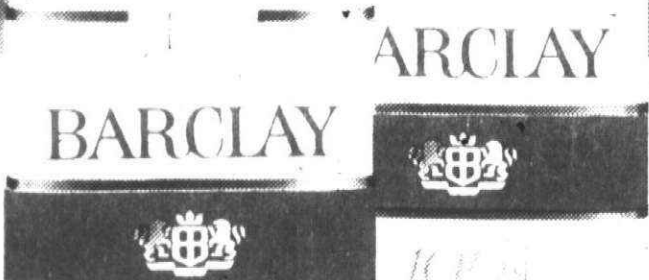

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Home a place to live, not an investment

When Phil Power bought these newspapers, he vowed they wouldn't be a political organ.

"When the Democrats do something silly or stupid, we will say so. When the Republicans do something silly or stupid, we will say so again," he said in just about those words.

What is good for politicians is also good for the real estate industry, a group I have been known to kick around when it had it coming. Now it gets a pat on the back.

Last week I heard a man in the real estate business say something that made sense.

"We've talked too much about the investment side of housing. You buy a home to live in," said Richard Elsea, president of Real Estate One, Inc.

IT'S TRUE. For years, people have plunked bigger and bigger chunks of their incomes into single-family detached houses on the theory they were somehow investing.

Realtors have conditioned us to think of the single-family detached house as a "home." Actually, an apartment can be a home. A condo can be a home. A farm can be a home. A trailer can be a home. Indeed, for the Bedouin, a tent is a home.

In national income accounting, an investment is something that produces more goods and services, like a factory, an office, a stamping machine, word-processing equipment, a wrench or a meeting table. Each year, the business depreciates part of the value as a cost of making sales.

A house is more properly thought of as a durable consumer good, like a silver table service or a stove. In the national income accounts, the use one gets from a house shows up as non-cash rent received. In other words, the house owner gets a valuable service for which he otherwise might have to pay rent.

So much for the macroeconomic side of houses. HOUSING IS supposed to be a great buy, to hear

some real estate salespersons tell it, because you get so many "tax deductions." Mostly untrue.

To begin with, money you spend on interest and property taxes is not deducted from federal income taxes. If you try it, you will go to prison.

Study the Schedule A with your last year's tax return, and you'll find interest and property taxes are reductions in taxable income. Look at lines 39 and 40 of Schedule A. Only the excess of line 39 over

40 is deductible from taxable income.

In my own return, the excess is \$823. Big deal. That reduction of taxable income is only a small portion of what we paid out in property taxes and interest.

FAR FROM producing dividends and interest — as do true investments — a home costs a lot of operating money.

I've mentioned property taxes and interest. There are also insurance, heat, electricity for lights, electricity for the water heater, water, sewer services, paint, landscaping, lawn care and repairs (know what a water heater costs these days?).

You sure don't pay those kinds of costs on your Merrill Lynch account.

Housing as an "investment" or as a "tax deduction" is nonsense.

A HOUSE as a way of living is something else. "You buy a house to live in," as Dick Elsea put it.

With your own house, you can have some fruit trees, a bird feeder, a private patio, frisky dogs, a work bench, more room for guests, a place to store your canoe, a rec room for your own pool table and many other things you can't have with other kinds of housing.

Realtors would be well advised to sell a house for what it is — a place to live your lifestyle — rather than for what it can't be — an investment and a method of beating taxes.

Telegraph boundary edges west

A sign outside the building bluntly states: "Stouffer's Northland Inn has discontinued operations. For reservation information please call 1-800-321-6888."

Taped to the wood-frame entrance door was a cardboard poster: "Edward C. Luz Company party at Superior Room, Michigan Inn."

The Edward C. Luz Company obviously had planned its party at Stouffer's Northland Inn before it was abruptly closed last week. Stouffer's officials cited the dismal economy and low occupancy rate in metro Detroit as reasons for the closing.

Whatever the reasons, last week's closing of Stouffer's Northland Inn was a sharp blow to Detroit and the suburbs.

Not many years ago, it was fashionable to draw a line along Eight Mile and Telegraph roads and pretend such metropolitan problems as hotel closings and crime existed only inside those lines. According to the theory, north and west of those roads were well-groomed suburban hideaways that were not afflicted by the harsh realities of city life.

That view has been slowly changing. Suburban communities have increasingly been facing some of the difficulties of metropolitan central cities.

Last week's closing of Stouffer's was another reminder. It may take a few years but Detroit's difficulties become the suburbs'.

I HAD BEEN to the Northland Inn only a few times. Last summer I visited several delegations staying there during the Republican National Convention.

When I walked into the Northland Inn last summer, it was a hustling, bustling place. Registration clerks were busy, and the lobby was filled with enthusiastic delegates.

A year later I had to peer through a padlocked door to look at the same lobby. The physical structure didn't look any different from 1980. The red brick exterior had been well maintained. Large, comfortable chairs were placed throughout the lobby. Several lamps were lighted. The fireplace even had some logs.

To the outsider it looked as if the hotel were still operating. One-half mile north, the lights of the newer Michigan Inn could be seen. Just east of the Michigan Inn is the large Southfield Sheraton. Maybe competition for the shrinking traveler dollar had killed the Northland Inn.

Only a few hundred yards away from the hotel stands the recently renovated Northland Shopping Center.

Northland is justifiably proud of the millions of dollars which have been spent into sprucing up the shopping area. The oldest of the major shopping centers in the Detroit area has not let age decay and destroy it. Instead it has literally put its money where its mouth is by investing in the future.

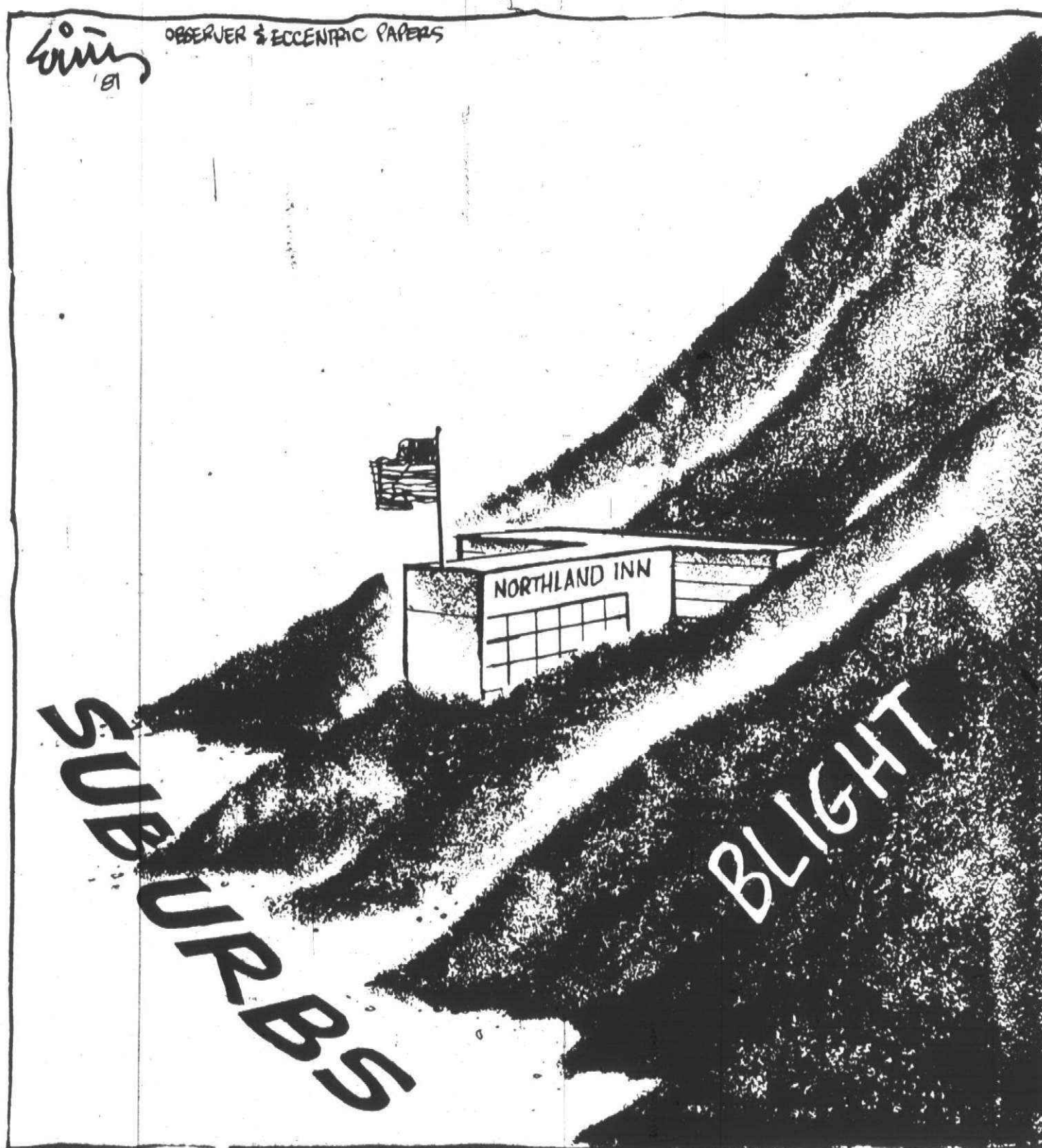
Last week was not a good week for Northland. In addition to the closing of a hotel which bore its name, Northland Center was hurt when a Detroit daily incorrectly stated in a headline that a woman had been stabbed to death in a Northland parking lot. Actually, she had been stabbed in the parking lot of a nearby office building.

WHAT THE MERCHANTS at Northland Shopping Center have done should serve as an example. As the difficulties of crime and age came to the center, they refused to fold up their tents and move to another area. They stood their ground and fought back. Despite Northland's setbacks last week, one has to wish the merchants well.

Consider the alternative to working on the problems of Detroit and our suburbs. One northern suburbanite told me recently, "I'd never let my daughter travel south of 10 Mile Road." So he's bringing the "Eight Mile Road line" a couple miles north.

When the I-696 freeway is completed, will the new line become 11 Mile Road? What after that — 14 or 15 Mile Road, Beech Daly or Middlebelt?

As the closing of the Northland Inn reminded us again, we can't continually run away from our problems.

Parent protests safety bus cuts

To the editor:

I would like some questions answered by the Plymouth-Canton Safety Committee and the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education regarding the proposal to eliminate safety busing of children less than 1 1/2 to one mile from school depending on grade level.

In this proposal to Field School, there are three phases: Phase I — improvements needed by opening of school year 1981-82.

Phase II — improvements needed by December 1, 1981.

Phase III — improvements needed by September 1, 1982.

If all the items under these three phases have been determined as necessary improvements for the safety of our children, then, why the different dates for these improvements? Why not all the improvements before the children are told they will walk?

The very first improvement should be lowering the speed limit on Lilley from the present 45 mph. This is improvement D of Phase II, which is not deemed necessary until Dec. 1, 1981. Are the children not in any danger crossing Lilley until Dec. 1, or are you willing to sacrifice any accidents until Dec. 1?

The walking path was put in over a year ago, and the fence is completed.

Why would the school district, with such money, problems OK the expense of these improvements before the police determine if it is even safe? How many of our tax dollars have been spent on this?

Why was the walking path not put in the clearing? Instead, it is put in the smallest area on the other, making it nearly invisible to any passing traffic north or south bound on Lilley. Any child could be attacked in the middle of that path without any motorist, passerby, or patrol car ever seeing a thing.

Why were the parents of these children not notified of any of this until after the decisions and proposals passed? Are our opinions and feelings of no value whatsoever in where our tax dollars are going or, MOST IMPORTANTLY, where the safety of our children is the issue?

Former Hilltop boss responds

To the editor:

On Aug. 10, you announced the opening of the new Plymouth Township Golf Course (Hilltop) and wondered how much the township had invested. The cost was stated as approximately \$1,200,000.

As a previous operator of this golf course, I would like to correct the recent statement about the "other lease" paying \$6,000 per year. Our original agreement signed in March 1975 called for us to furnish all equipment, labor and insurance, to operate same, for four seasons (42 months) at \$45,000. We invested more than \$70,000 to complete our lease.

First week after we signed the agreement, township officials broke our lease by condemning their own clubhouse. Unlike the present operator, we did not sue the township board; instead, plan "B" was offered: \$6,000 per year, plus a new approved clubhouse, to be furnished at our expense, installed on the course. All expenses for plumbing, electrical permits and state of Michigan approval codes were paid by our corporation.

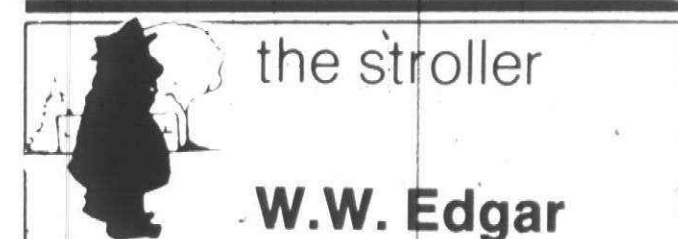
Upon completion of our four-season lease of the nine-hole course, we were notified by Frank Millington (Plymouth Township) ex-trustee, that a minimum of \$35,000 per year was the only acceptable bid. We objected at a public board meeting and the township auditor, Harvey Ziel, agreed that the terms were impossible from previous revenue records.

During the time of our lease, we did not request a contract adjustment, as did the present lessee, which he was granted. We fulfilled our financial obligation to the township of Plymouth, of said original contract.

I regret that the Township of Plymouth officials did not have the courtesy to acknowledge that the Ross family performed over and above our agreement. Presently, we manage Fellows Creek Golf Course, owned by Canton Township. In our 40 months of operation of this business, we have generated revenue for Canton Township in excess of \$500,000 or \$12,500 per month.

We welcome the new Hilltop Golf Course and also challenge John Jawor and Maurice Breen to equal our program above. All our records are public knowledge and are available for inspection. We would appreciate that your paper refer to us as Hilltop Glen Golf, Inc., or Ross Family.

Money cheap in all sports

One need look no further than the sports pages of the public prints across the land to learn how cheap the American dollar has become.

There, almost every day, you may read accounts of athletes becoming modern millionaires, and there is no telling just when it will stop.

It was thought that when the baseball players started getting paid in the hundreds of thousands for a season, the peak may have been reached.

Then along came the Los Angeles Lakers of the National Basketball League to pay Irvin (Magic) Johnson, the former Michigan State basketball star, \$1 million a year for a firm contract of 25 years. And just imagine, he is only 22 years old and two years out of school.

THERE WAS SOME eyebrow lifting when the Tigers were forced to pay Steve Kemp \$600,000 a year when he took his case to arbitration.

But one of the peaks in another line of play rose when it was published that Tommy Hearns, the young Detroit welterweight fighter, will be paid \$5 million for his bout with Sugar Ray Leonard next month in Las Vegas. What's more, Leonard will be paid \$8 million as his end of the purse.

It seems incredible that fighters can earn that much for what could be only a few minutes of competition. Don't forget that Joe Louis stopped Max Schmeling in 2:04 of the first round in their 1938 meeting.

Most fans compare Hearns' coming purse with the money Louis earned. Joe defended his heavyweight title 14 times, and yet his career earnings were slightly more than \$5 million.

The comparison isn't fair because Louis was paid in what are now called "hard" dollars. But the comparison goes on.

A REVIEW of championship fights in history shows how the dollar has cheapened.

Back in 1910, Tex Rickard, the famed promoter, put up a purse of \$100,000 to bring Jim Jeffries out of retirement to meet Jack Johnson for the heavyweight title in Reno. At that time, there was plenty of eyebrow lifting that fighters could get that much money.

Years later, after defeating Jack Dempsey for the second time to keep the heavyweight title, Gene Tunney demanded \$1 million for his last fight before retirement. And he got it when he fought — and defeated — Tom Heeney to retire as the undefeated champion. And that was 50 years ago!

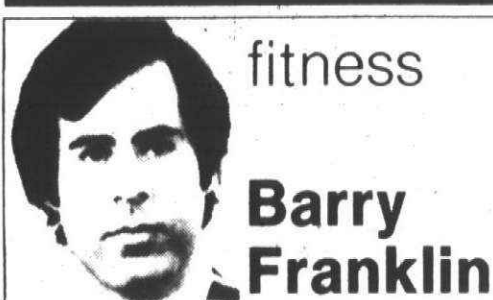
Since then, purses have risen higher and higher until now it is common for an athlete to demand millions. This is the case with Tommy Hearns, Detroit's latest athletic idol.

Tommy has had only a few dozen fights. True, he won most by knockouts, but it seems impossible he will be paid \$5 million for his meeting with Sugar Ray Leonard regardless of the outcome.

It does show how cheap the American dollar has become, especially in the sports world.

Will carbohydrates boost an athlete's endurance?

Question: As a marathon runner, I am curious about the dietary practice called "carbohydrate loading" to improve performance.

Why is stored carbohydrate (glycogen) so important to sustained high-intensity performance? How does one maximally increase muscle glycogen stores prior to competition?

Are there any detrimental health effects related to this procedure?

J.K., West Bloomfield

Sports medicine studies generally support the contention that increased carbohydrate intake (sugars and starches) results in improved athletic performance — particularly in prolonged endurance events.

The athlete with adequate muscle glycogen stores will be able to perform for a longer duration at a higher intensity or pace.

You rely on fat as your major fuel source for mild exercise, but as you increase your running speed or exercise intensity, your body relies increasingly on carbohydrates. This is primarily because carbohydrates provide the greatest energy yield.

DURING PROLONGED exercise (e.g., marathon running), your body may use up all of its limited carbohydrate reserves. While you may be able to continue exercising, you will have to decrease your running speed.

Trying to run at faster speeds while burning fat, a low intensity exercise fuel, will simply result in fatigue and muscular exhaustion.

To achieve the highest pre-race level of muscle glycogen, scientists recommend you first deplete your glycogen store through an exhaustive bout of prolonged exercise. This should be done about one week before competition.

For the next four days, you should maintain these low glycogen stores by continued training and a diet composed almost exclusively of fat and protein. The three days before the race should be reserved for a carbohydrate-rich diet with only mild workouts.

This regimen will produce an "overshoot phenomenon," creating the greatest possible glycogen storage in the muscles.

SOME PHYSICIANS have expressed concern over the potential medical risks associated with carbohydrate loading.

The days began with a flag ceremony and the setting up of individual units. They met each day at the singing tree and again at the end of the day for the closing flag ceremony.

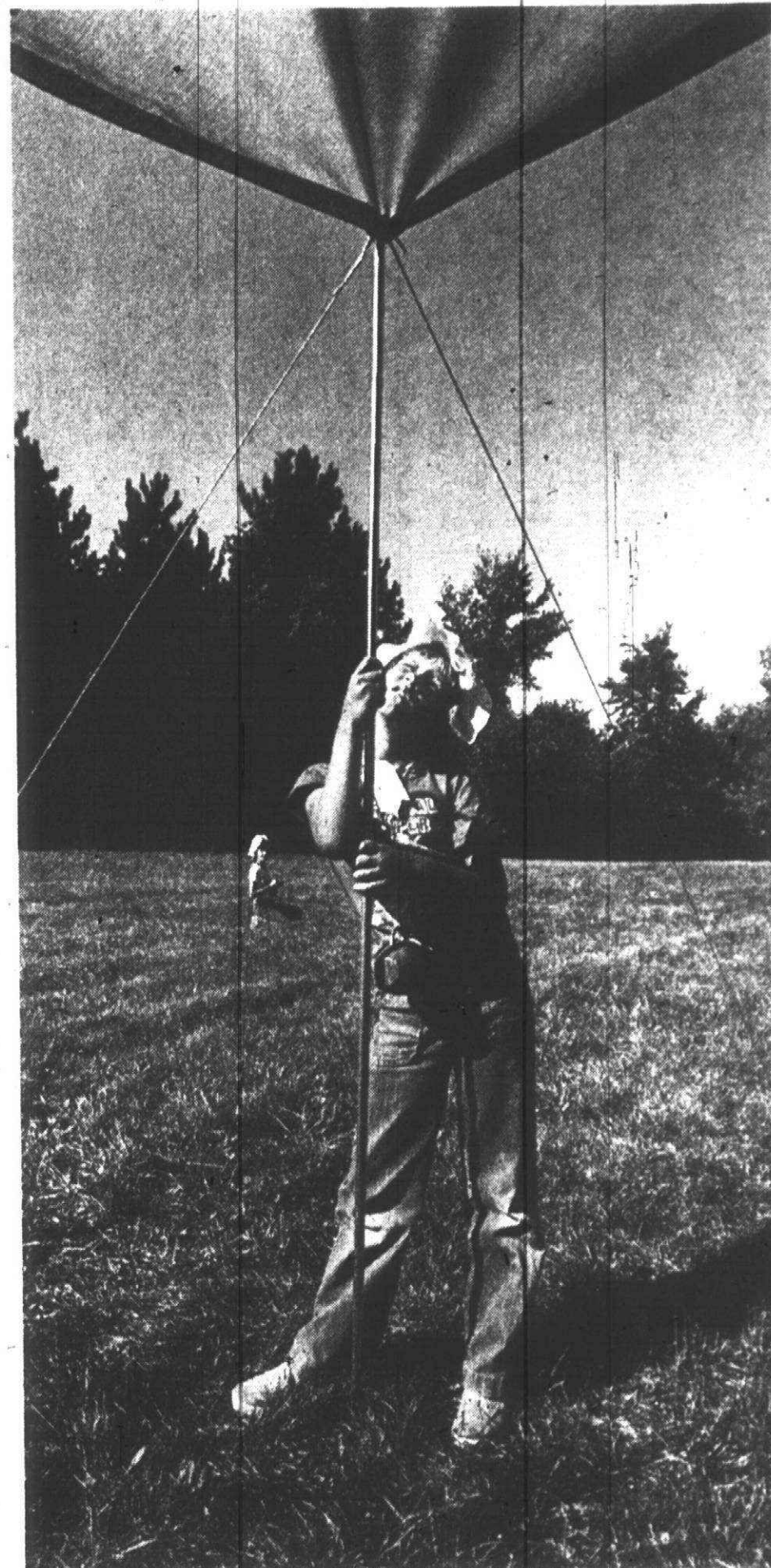
The weather was perfect, and on Friday, the scouts invited their families out for an all-camp picnic followed by a program and closing flag ceremonies.

Antique chairs restored to original beauty

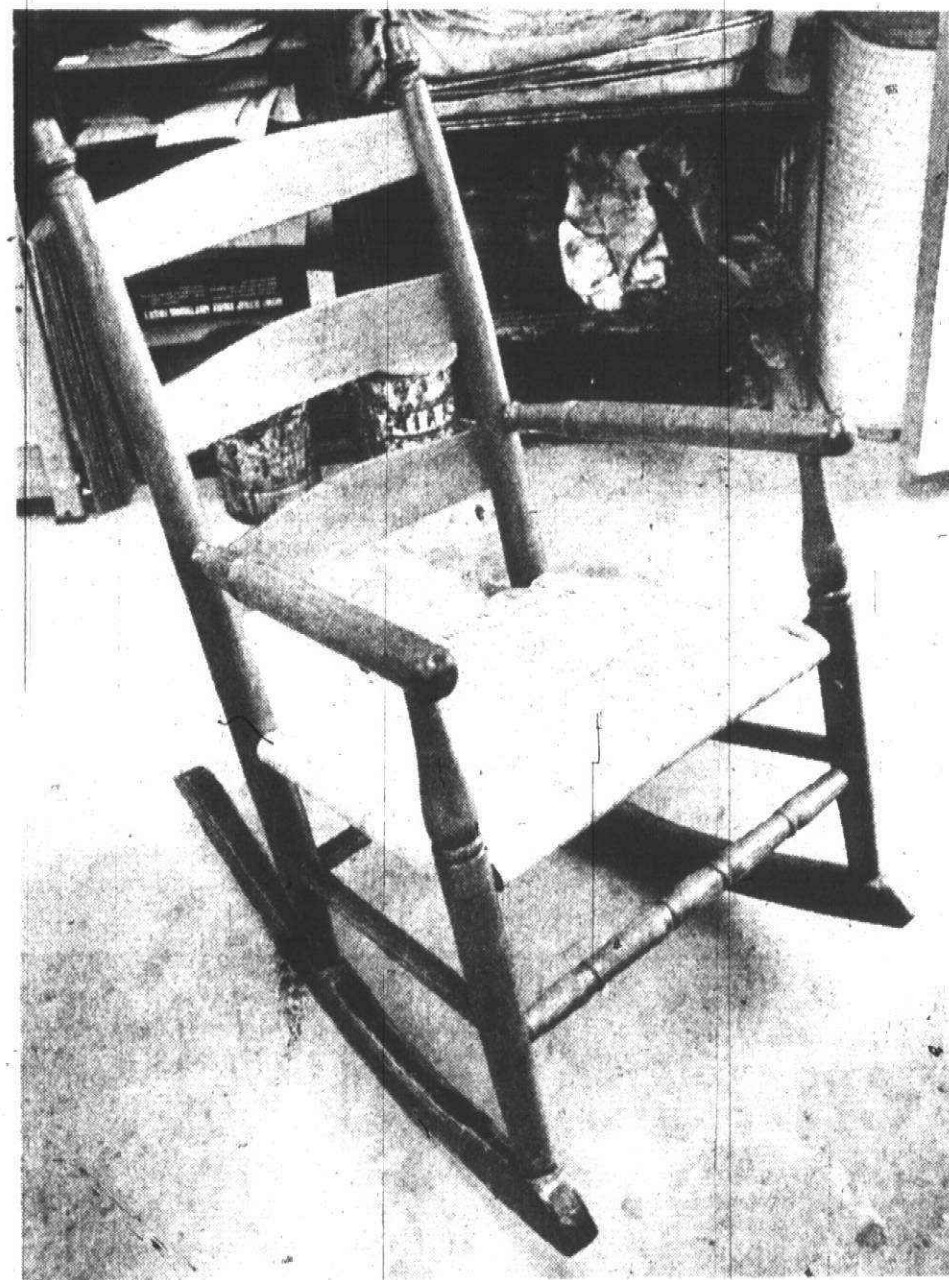

"Perhaps because the older ones are smaller and less comfortable. People were not as big as they are today."

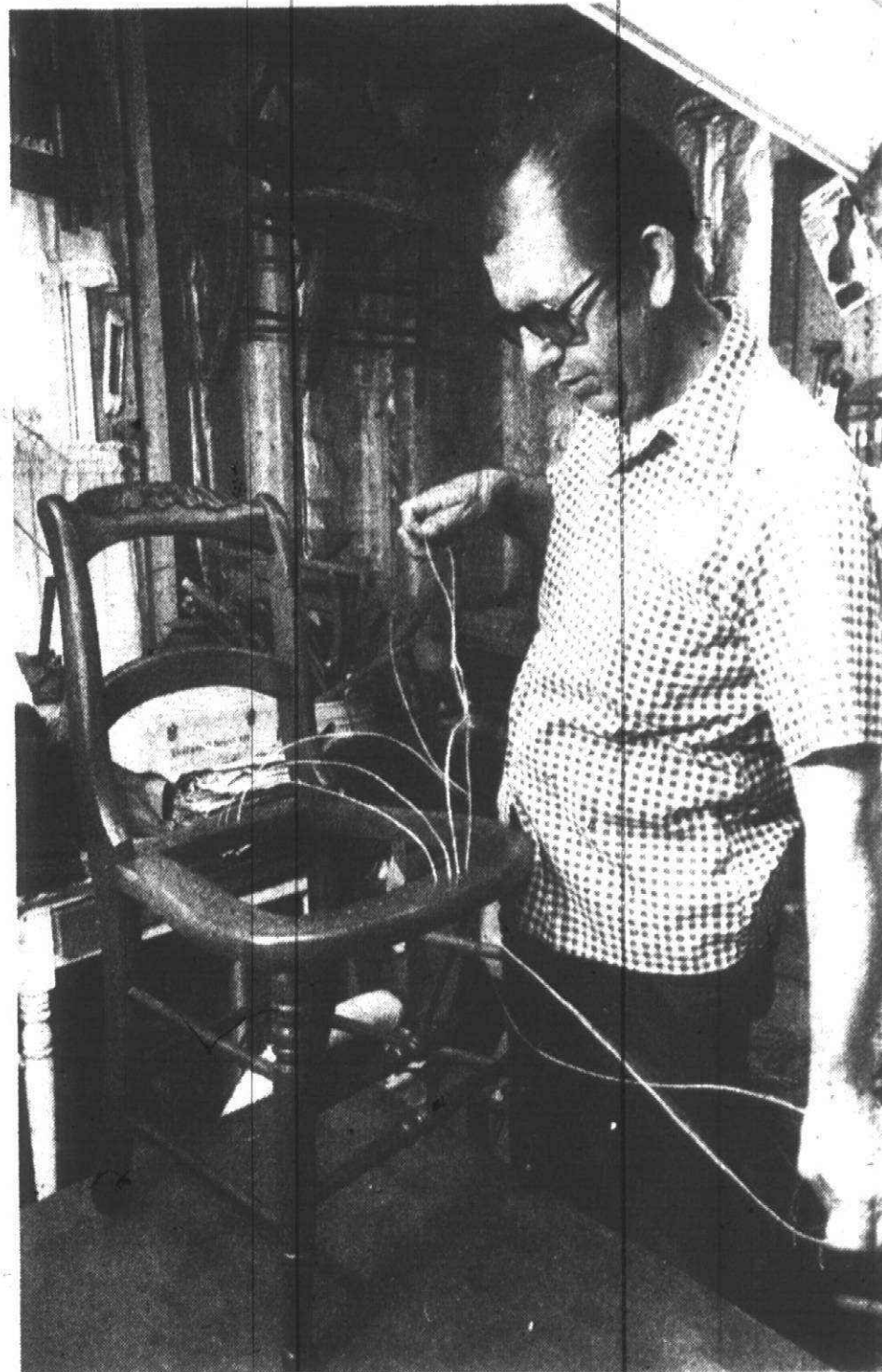

It certainly looks very difficult and tedious but it is as easy as poking holes into a cloth with a pattern. For more information about the forbidden stitch call 981-1582.

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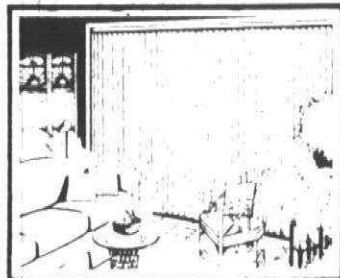

Area Hindus plan week of ceremonies

Westland, Livonia and Canton residents, who are members of a 2,500-year-old Hindu religion of India will celebrate with fasting, praying and chanting the week of Paryushana Parva that ends Tuesday, Sept. 2.

Observed with the kind of solemnity as Christians give their Christmas worship, the celebration is a yearly event sponsored by the Jain Society of Greater Detroit.

The society is headquartered at 10422 Woodland, Taylor, and its members are Indians who carried their religion with them when they moved to this country about 10 years ago to find employment opportunities. Among them are Mr. and Mrs. Mahendra J. Shah of Westland, Mr. and Mrs. Ashok Choksi of Livonia and Mr. and Mrs. Sudhir Shah of Canton.

The ceremonies, important to the society members because they present an opportunity for passing on to their children the religion of their homeland, take place in homes.

The women dress in the traditional Indian sari. The

home of the Shahs, 33370 Hunter, Westland, will be the scene of a bhavana (religious talks and singing) at 7 p.m. Friday, and another bhavana will be held at 7 p.m. Sunday in the home of the Choksis, 36136 Hees, Livonia. Similar events are planned for members' homes in Rochester, Bloomfield Hills, Birmingham, Troy and Dearborn.

Highlighting the week will be a visit by high priest Muni Shree Sushil Kumarji to Wylie Groves High School, 20500 W. 13 Mile, Birmingham, on Saturday.

This event also will involve the children. He will speak to them at 6 p.m. and at 7 p.m. will address their elders with a lecture on the topic "The Importance of Religion and Meditation in Our Life."

IN HIS PRESENTATION, he will employ religious rituals as well as the science and technique of yoga. With 45 years experience in spiritual practice and study, he is regarded as both saint and scholar. A professor of literature and philosophy, he is founder of several colleges in India.

His main center in this country is the Acharya Sushil

Jain Ashram in Staten Island, N.Y. Another is located in Westport, Conn.

The spiritual leader wears white clothing, as well as a white mask to prevent him from swallowing insects. His religion in India has about 2.8 million adherents, and emphasizes equal kindness to all life. It is a vegetarian, pacifist, ascetic sect, which is part of the Hindu religion.

Followers pray to 24 gods called Thrinkharas. Each night during Paryushana Parva week they will sit on the floor around figures of their gods, light candles or lights, and chant and pray.

Special thoughts are directed to the 24th god, Lord Mahavir, born about 2,500 years ago to a wealthy family. He renounced his wealth to search for eternal truth. He eventually came to favor non-violence, truth and helping others.

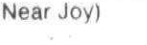

Classix Nouveaux combines old, new

Eerie winds blow their persistent call as thunder builds in the distance. Synthesized sounds grow into a beat you can't ignore. The English band Classix Nouveaux has created a sound unlike all other music.

The band, which is led by singer-songwriter Sal Solo, will appear at 8:30 p.m. Monday at Nitro. Solo's completely bald head and Bowie-like vocals add to the mystery behind C. Nouveaux.

Solo not only wrote all the songs on the debut LP, simply entitled "Classix Nouveaux," but also co-produced the album with bassist and fellow keyboardist M. Sweeney.

The band name comes from "Nouveaux," meaning "new," and "Classix" from "classic," meaning an established standard. Together the name suggests something that's been around long enough to be proven and new enough to be original.

C. NOUVEAUX'S music has recently been described as "blitz." Rock, pop,

power pop, punk, new wave, country, crossover, reggae, ska, bop, jazz progressive. Help! Not another term.

"Blitz," is defined as "rooted in the '50s rockabilly, early '60s mod scene, late '60s psychedelia, and early '70s new wave."

This type of music borrows influences from Roxy Music, David Bowie, T. Rex, The Who, The Kinks, Brian Eno, Genesis and Kraftwerk. "Blitz" bands have a beat that's uncontrollable (which means it gets a '10' on the dance floor) and is loaded with synthesized keyboards, guitar and even electric drums.

Guitarist Gary Steadman and drummer B.P. Hurdling will join fellow Classix to perform songs like "Guilty," "Nasty Little Green Men" and "Robots Dance." The music is actually quite commercial and surprisingly enjoyable for such a gruesome bunch.

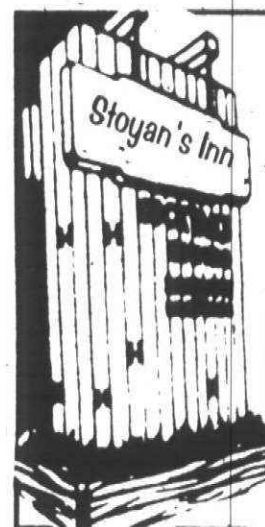

AGGRESSIVE PLAY

In the example, white has a 4-1 to play. White has the doubling cube at the 2 level.

Without thinking, many players would move a checker from the 12 to the 8 point, or from the 8 to the 4 point and from the black 1 to the 2 point. These moves are totally safe yet very unproductive. Any safe move for this position cannot be correct.

Do you see the black checkers on the 4, 6, 7 and 8 points? On black's next roll, he is a favorite to hit white and capture the 3 point. If unsuccessful, black may roll a 4, capture the white 5 point and slot-hit white on the 3 point. Either way, black's intentions for his next roll are to attack white. White could soon be in serious trouble and perhaps lose a gammon. With the cube on 2, a four-point loss in a tournament match is devastating.

Realizing this strategy, white should avoid the coming attack from black and use this 4-1 roll to the fullest advantage. White should attack black by moving from the 6 point, hitting black on the 5 point, and hitting black on the

1 point with the same checker. For this and similar positions, a "tempo play" can be very effective.

Although seemingly bizarre, the purpose of a tempo play is to steal your opponent's entire roll (or half a roll by hitting one checker), which will temporarily stop him from crushing you on his next roll. Black will be busy re-entering both checkers from the bar and, except for a perfect double, cannot harm white.

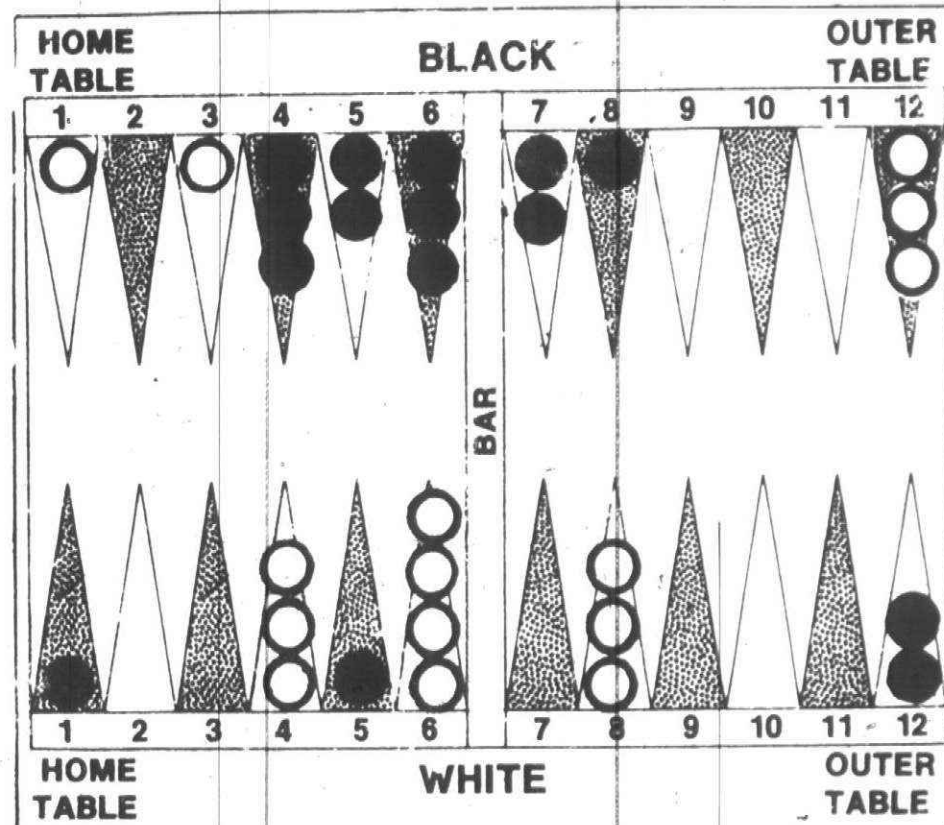
Of course, the only risk for these moves is being hit back. But if you are hit, the tempo play is worth risking as long as you have a chance to grab a forward anchor in your opponent's home board or reposition yourself.

Also, since white has the doubling cube, he can afford a gutsy play. In this position, the game could easily turn to favor white, if black stays on the bar for one roll. If white can cover his 1 point blot on the next roll and/or hit black's blot on the 8 point, white may be in position to redouble black to 4.

Remember, backgammon is made up of continuous calculated risks. Always playing the game "safe" really takes all the fun out of it!

Speed merchant Canton racer calms rough waters

Boat racing is different to Elwin Hahn than it is to most others. Hahn grew up on a lake, and despite the dangers of boat racing, he enjoys it and plans on turning professional next summer.

"I think that you have to experience it to understand why I do it," said the pharmacist from Canton. "You could say that I'm flirting with death, so to speak. I don't think it's quite that bad, but it is exhilarating."

Hahn may not be flirting with death to a great degree, but with his V-bottom boat, which runs in the outboard division going upwards of 80 mph, he is risking serious injury if things don't go according to plan.

"I've had friends that have been in accidents and that does have an effect on you subconsciously," said Hahn. "I've had a few accidents, cracked a couple ribs a few times, but nothing serious."

Hahn's summer of racing has been slower than usual and not as successful as he would have liked,

but he is still going to turn pro next year.

"It was so-so," he said of his performances. "I've won a couple and lost a couple."

HAHN RACES at both Columbiaville and Ford Lake. The races are one-quarter mile from standing starts.

The prizes that Hahn wins as an amateur are mostly trophies, although sometimes cash prizes are awarded, ranging anywhere from \$100-\$500. The money that is won, however, still doesn't pay for what's put into the boat, according to Hahn.

The V-bottom boats are "very touchy to drive," said Hahn. The nose of the boat must be high out of the water with as little of the rear portion hugging the water. The main concern of the driver is preventing the boat from tipping over backwards.

"When you're going well," said the 32-year-old, "only about six inches of the boat is touching (the water) at one time."

A few friends Hahn grew up with have turned to the professional

ranks, the most notable being Dick Austin who is a world record holder in the hydro-plane event.

"We just grew up with boats," said Hahn. "We learned how to make them go faster and faster."

No special training is needed to be a boat racer although it does take experience to get a feel for driving at high rates of speed.

PROTECTIVE clothing is worn by the driver. The special gear includes a padded vest and a helmet.

Hahn's \$8,500 boat is insured. Many other boats, however, of different classifications, are not because the risk of an accident is so great. The blown-fuel flatbottom boat, for instance, worth approximately \$30,000 with speeds approaching 160 mph, are not covered. And Hahn reminds that a single accident is all it takes to ruin a boat completely.

Hahn's wife, Rosemary, enjoys the racing scene, although "it makes for some tense moments."

Hahn's machine is stored in the family garage. It's used on week-ends as a recreational vehicle.

"I enjoy it (boat racing)," said Hahn. "It's the people and the boat racing combined that makes it enjoyable."

'Nice guy' Ernie loved by all

As even fair-weather Tiger fans realize by now, Tiger announcer Ernie Harwell recently joined the ranks of renowned broadcasters Mel Allen, Red Barber, Bob Elson and Russ Hodges in baseball's Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y.

That completes the roster when it comes to Ernie's ilk in the hallowed Hall. Quite an accomplishment for someone who at the age of 5 attended elocution school because he was "tongue-tied."

It sounded like a great feature story. But Harwell, a Farmington Hills resident, defies the typical feature format. What makes him tick goes beyond baseball, and that's exactly why they say: "If you don't like Ernie Harwell, there must be something wrong with you."

Baseball commissioner Bowie Kuhn describes the Tiger announcer of 22 years this way: "Ernie Harwell is a fine gentleman and an outstanding broadcaster who richly deserved the Ford Frick memorial award for broadcasting excellence. His contributions to baseball over the years include not only his highly professional on-air commentary but also his selfless giving to others, both in and out of baseball."

JIM CAMPBELL, Tiger president and general manager: "Ernie is the professional of all professionals in his area. He's the finest sports broadcaster in professional baseball in the country. There aren't enough good things to say about him."

George Kell, Tiger television announcer who won the 1949 American League batting title as a Tiger: "Ernie Harwell is an outstanding individual — a fine Christian man and a good family man. He's a credit to his community and to his profession."

Fred Smith, Tiger group sales manager who co-authored the books "Tiger Trivia" and "Sons of Trivia" with Harwell: "Ernie Harwell is an altruistic individual, which is the nicest thing you can say about anyone. He lives for God and his fellow man. He's a great broadcaster and a great individual."

"Walking through the stadium, he has a cheery hello for every sweeper and vendor. It could be

Bowie Kuhn or a bum off the street — he doesn't care."

Paul Carey, Harwell's fellow announcer: "I can't imagine working with anyone who could make things more pleasant. We work about 175 games shoulder-to-shoulder in a year's time, and that booth can get awfully small unless you've got someone as patient and tolerant as Ernie to work with. We all have egos to a certain degree, and Ernie's is one of the smallest I've ever seen."

IT SHOULDN'T have been such a surprise, but "the voice of the Tigers" answered a telephone request for an interview by inviting me to his home.

Half an hour later, a barefoot and smiling Harwell opened the door of his spacious home and led the way to the table.

Lulu Harwell had a tasty lunch ready — chicken salad complete with ripe cantaloupe offered to Ernie by a loyal listener.

The Harwells chatted about how they met and fell in love while attending college in Georgia, and about their children — Bill, 37, Gray, 35, and twins Julie and Carolyn, 23.

"They're the reason we moved back to Michigan from Florida last April," said the 63-year-old Harwell. "We really missed them."

"We're still getting settled in — Ernie's study is the 'gonna room.' We're gonna do this and we're gonna do that," laughed Lulu, who later left for a nursing home where she does volunteer work.

"I'm not too handy around the house, but she can shame me into it," said Harwell, who planted trees, dug flower beds and hung pictures during the baseball strike.

His feelings on that issue? "I just wanted 'em to play," said Harwell. "You'd think two groups of grown men could be reasonable enough to get together."

On the Tigers: "They're a meat-and-potatoes organization — and one of the strongest in baseball. Jim Campbell and John Fetzer run it as a business, and they really want to produce a winner."

The doubles winners came away with \$200 and the runner-ups, \$100.

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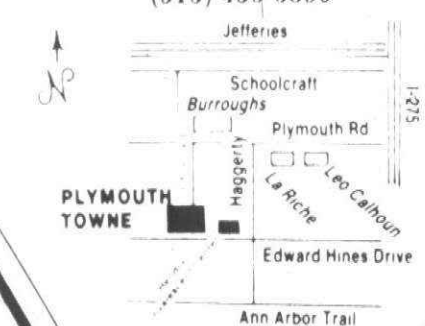
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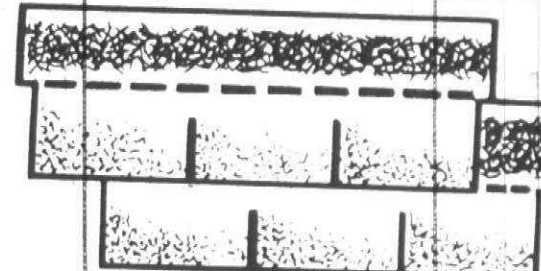

Terri Eudy and a cast of proven veterans gives Plymouth Salem girls' swim coach Chuck Olson reason for optimism in 1981.

"I think we can move up," predicts Olson. "It depends on how some of the others will come around. We could be a real decent team this year."

Salem finished fourth in the tough Suburban Eight League last year. Livonia Bentley, the defending champ, is loaded again. Dearborn, with record breaker Patty Sabo back, also figures to make a splash.

The diving ranks have been depleted and Olson is worried.

"We have Cindy McSurely," said Olson, "and she qualified for the regional."

"But she's the only one out. Cindy

will get us points, but we need help. I'm looking for divers."

Junior Corinne Cabadas, who cracked last year's Observerland rankings in the 100 breaststroke with a time of 1:14.2, also returns. She was second in total points a year ago.

Other junior returnees include Sallie Weimer, Ellen Wall, Kim Nelson and Ruth Ettinger. They are joined by two seniors, Debbie Darlington and Nancy Workman.

B.J. Bing and Amy Dunn, both sophomores, also return after making heavy contributions last fall.

The Rocks, 8-4 overall last season in dual meets, will open the season Tuesday, Sept. 15 against non-league foe Farmington Harrison.

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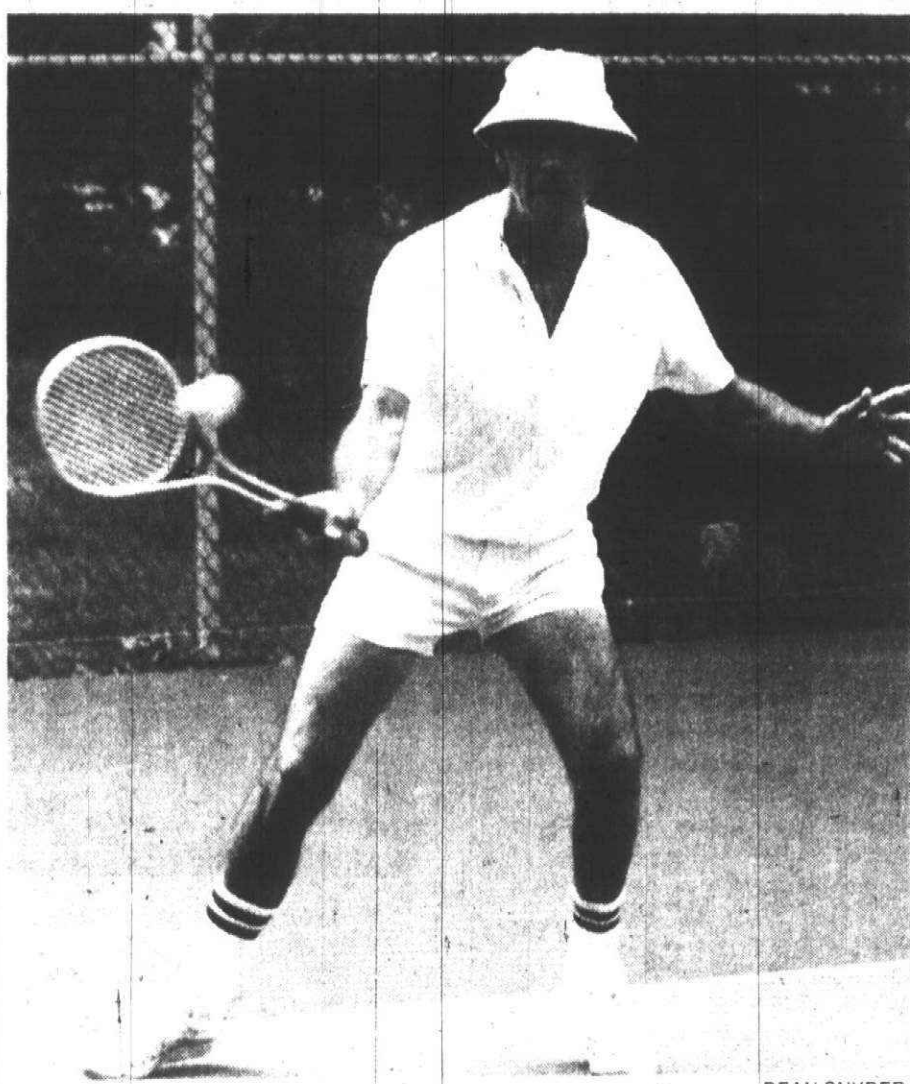

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

Strong faith lifts Tiger announcer

On his hobby, songwriting: "I can play the organ, but really badly — never where they can hear me. I think they'd let me play at Tiger Stadium if they wanted to get the crowd out in a hurry," he joked.

Harwell is an accomplished lyricist with over 35 recorded songs, including "Move Over Babe," popularized by NBC while Hank Aaron chased Babe Ruth's home-run record. Among the disco, country, ballad and soul record labels bearing Harwell's name are hits by B.J. Thomas ("I Just Don't Know Any Better") and Jose Feliciano ("They Ain't Heard Me Yet"). He's also written several songs with academy award-winning songwriter Sammy Fain.

ON HIS START in the business: "I began as The Sporting News' Atlanta correspondent when I was 16," said Harwell. "While I was still in school, I got a job working in the sports department for the Atlanta Constitution doing what nobody else would do. After I graduated, I happened to take an audition with (Atlanta radio station) WSB. They put up with what I did."

On the future: "I'll keep showing up for my job as long as I'm healthy and as long as they want me. I don't want to quit — I enjoy it so much. God really blesses somebody when

he gives him a job he enjoys doing," Harwell said.

On the highlights of his career: "I'd say the greatest memories for me are the Bobby Thomson home run that beat the Brooklyn Dodgers and won the pennant for the New York Giants in 1951; the 1968 World Series; my induction at Cooperstown (captured in dozens of photographs that Harwell flipped through, proudly pointing out his children and grandchildren) and the Billy Graham Crusade in 1961."

"That was the year I dedicated my life to Christ. Through God's help, I've set my priorities a little straighter since then. He's first — other things come later."

"Everything I do has to be for him. All my ability comes from God. When I have problems, God helps me face them. There's a certain peace you get."

(That was evident in the way Harwell answered a battery of phone calls from musicians, friends and family. Each one heard a voice full of vim and vigor answer, "Hi! What's happenin'?")

There's a certain peace you get just visiting with this first-class, Hall-of-Famer. Harwell's farewell was an invitation to visit again ("and bring a friend!") and a quote from Ecclesiastes, "There is nothing better for a man than that he should eat and drink and make his soul enjoy good in his labor. This also I saw that it was from the hand of God."

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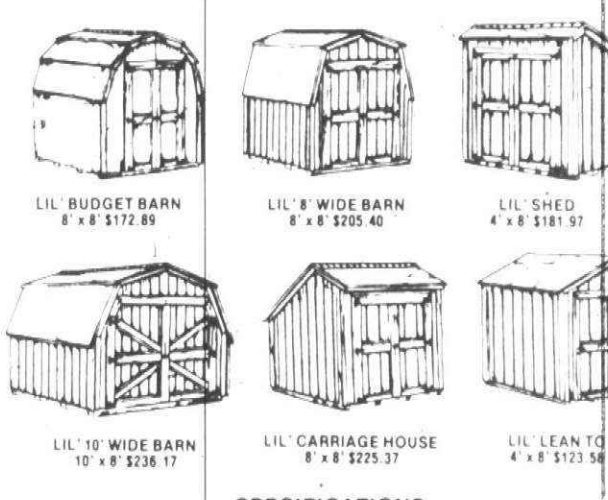

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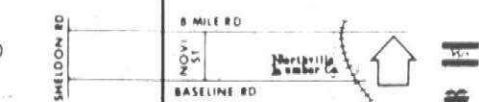

ORDINANCE NO. 81-7

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH BY ADDING A NEW SECTION, WHICH NEW SECTION SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS SECTION 7.143 OF CHAPTER 77 OF TITLE VII, BUSINESS AND TRADES, OF SAID CODE

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS

Section 1. Section 7.143 of Chapter 77, Business and Trades, of the Code of the City of Plymouth is hereby added to read as follows:

MECHANICAL OR ELECTRONIC AMUSEMENT DEVICES

7.143 Mechanical or Electronic Amusement Devices.

(1) Definition of terms. As used in this ordinance, unless the context otherwise indicates:

(a) The term "Mechanical or electronic amusement device" shall mean any machine or device which, upon the insertion of a coin, slug, token, plate or disc, may be operated by the public generally by manipulating special equipment whereby a score is established, the object of which is to secure a special number or numbers or a high total score, whether a prize is offered or not, when element of skill in grabbing articles predominates over chance or luck.

(b) The terms "person," "corporation," or "association," as used herein shall include the following: Any person, firm, corporation or association which owns any such machine, the person, firm, corporation or association in whose place of business any such machine is placed for use by the public; and the person, firm, corporation or association having control over such machine; provided, however, that the payment of such fee by any person, firm, corporation or association enumerated herein shall be deemed in compliance with this section of the ordinance.

(2) Gambling devices not permitted. Nothing in this ordinance shall in any way be construed to authorize, license or permit any gambling devices whatsoever, or any mechanism that has been judicially determined to be a gambling device, or in any way contrary to law, or that may be contrary to any future laws of the State of Michigan.

(3) License required. Any person, firm, corporation or association displaying for public patronage or keeping for operation any mechanical or electronic amusement device as herein defined by Section (a) shall be required to obtain a license from the City of Plymouth, upon payment of a license fee. Application shall be made to the City of Plymouth upon a form to be supplied by the City Clerk for that purpose.

(4) Application. The application for such license shall contain the following information:

(a) Name and address of the applicant, age, date and place of birth.
(b) Prior convictions of applicant, if any.
(c) Place where machine or device is to be displayed or operated, and the business conducted at that place.
(d) Description of machine to be covered by the license, mechanical features, name of manufacturer, serial number.
(e) Name and address of the owner of the amusement device.

No license shall be issued to any applicant unless he shall be over legal age and a citizen of the United States. An applicant who has been convicted of a criminal offense involving gambling, narcotics, or criminal sexual conduct shall be disqualified as an applicant if such conviction occurred within a two-year period prior to application.

(5) Inspection. Application for license shall be made out in duplicate, one copy being referred to the Chief of Police, and the other copy to the City Electrical Inspector.

(a) The Chief of Police shall investigate the location wherein it is proposed to operate such machine, ascertain if the applicant is a person of good moral character, and either approve or disapprove the application.
(b) The Electrical Inspector shall inspect all wiring and connections to the machine, determine if the same complies with the Electrical Code of the City of Plymouth, and shall either approve or disapprove the application.

(6) License fees. Every applicant, before being granted a license shall pay the following annual license fee for the privilege of operating or maintaining for operation each mechanical amusement device as defined in Section (1) (a) herein: Electronic and mechanical amusement devices - \$200.00 per machine. Each license shall expire on December 31 of each year. Transfers shall be \$25.00 per machine.

(7) Display of License.

(a) The license or licenses herein provided for shall be posted permanently and conspicuously at the location of the machine in the premises wherein the device is to be operated or maintained to be operated.

(b) Such license may be transferred from one machine or device to another similar machine upon application to the City Clerk to such effect and the giving of a description and the serial number of the new machine or device. Not more than one machine shall be operated under one license, and the applicant or licensee shall be required to secure a license for each and every machine displayed or operated by him.

(c) If the licensee shall move his place of business to another location within the City of Plymouth, the license may be transferred to such new location upon application to the City Clerk, giving the street and number of the new location. The new location shall be approved by the Chief of Police and the City Electrical Inspector in the same manner as provided in Section (5) of this ordinance.

(8) Prohibition and Restrictions

(a) No person, firm, corporation, or association shall permit the playing of mechanical amusement devices within 300 feet of any public or parochial school building. No person, firm, corporation, or association shall be permitted to operate more than seven (7) mechanical amusement devices in any building.

(9) Revocation of License. Every license issued under this ordinance is subject to the right, which is hereby expressly reserved, to revoke the same should the licensee, directly or indirectly permit the operation of any mechanical amusement device contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, the ordinances of the City of Plymouth or the law of the State of Michigan.

Said license may be revoked by the City Commission after written notice to the licensee, which notice shall specify the ordinance or law violations with which the licensee is charged, if after a hearing the licensee is found to be guilty of such violations. Ten (10) days notice of the hearing shall be given the licensee. At such hearing the licensee and his attorney may present and submit evidence of witnesses in his defense.

(10) Seizure and destruction of machine. If the Chief of Police shall have reason to believe any mechanical or electronic amusement device is a gambling device, such machine may be seized by the police and impounded and if upon trial of the exhibitor the machine is proven to be a gambling device, said exhibitor to be found guilty and such machine shall be destroyed by the police.

(11) Penalty. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, in addition to the revocation of his or its license, shall be liable to a penalty of 90 days and/or a fine of \$500.00 or any part of that or probation for each offense.

(12) Repeal of conflicting ordinance. All existing ordinances of the City of Plymouth are hereby repealed insofar as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance.

(13) Separability of provisions. It is the intention of the City of Plymouth Commission that each separate provision of this ordinance shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein, and it is further the intention of the City Commission that if any provision of this ordinance be declared invalid, all other provisions thereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section 2. This ordinance shall become operative and effective on the 8th day of September, 1981.
