### Roller rink party delayed

The grand-opening party for Skatin' Station, the new roller rink in the Plymouth-Canton community, is postponed to Sunday, Dec. 13. It originally was scheduled for this Sunday night.

"Some unexpected things happened around here so we postponed it one week," said Jan Olson, Skatin' Station assistant manager.

Ms. Olson would not elaborate on the "unexpected things."

"Oh, you can buff it for us, can't you?" Ms. Olson asked the Observer.

Woody Lynch, owner of the \$1.25 million facility on Joy Road between Lilley and Haggerty, was out of town and unavailable for comment.

The party now is scheduled from 7 p.m. to midnight Dec. 13. There will be prizes, entertainment, food and open skating at the event. Tickets are \$10 per person.

THE PARTY, as originally planned, will serve as a fund raiser for Plymouth and Canton area recreational programs. Skatin' Station will donate revenue up to \$10,000 from this party to the city of Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth Township for recreational use.

Tickets for the event were not received by the Plymouth or Canton recreation offices until Monday afternoon, however. A Plymouth Township official said Tuesday the township office had not received tickets for the

event, although a Skatin' Station spokesman had contacted Supervisor Maurice Breen about the ticket sale.

Plymouth Township does not have a recreation department, but tickets are expected to be sold at the township office, on Ann Arbor Road at Lilley.

MIKE GOUIN and Chuck Skene, the respective Canton and Plymouth recreation directors, both said they received the tickets on Monday. The date on the tickets was crossed out from Dec. 6 to Dec. 13.

Gouin said he received "about 500" tickets. Skene's office reported 340 tickets.

Gouin added it may be difficult to sell the tickets during the holiday season.

"This time of the year — it's going to be tough to sell," he said.

Funds from the ticket sales will be donated based on the percentage sold by each agency, Lynch said two weeks ago.

The Plymouth recreation department is at the Cultural Center on Farmer in Plymouth. Canton recreation department is in the basement of Canton Township Hall, on Canton Center Road south of Cherry Hill.

Gouin said he will contact officials from the Plymouth-Canton junior league sports teams — asking for support in selling tickets. He added that any Canton tickets sold by the junior sports teams would result in 100 percent revenue for the respective league.

### Doors close on video-game discussions

The growing popularity of Space Invaders forced Canton's Board of Trustees to close the door on public discussion during Tuesday night's regular meeting.

Trustees met for more than two hours in closed session with township attorney C. Gerald Hemming to discuss possible revision on the current mechanical device ordinance.

Although no formal decisions were made, Hemming was instructed by the board to rewrite the ordinance. It may appear on next week's agenda for board discussion.

Recently, many persons have approached Canton's board requesting to open businesses that include many popular video-electronic games.

MANY TRUSTEES feel the current ordinance has unrealistic, and possibly unconstitutional, provisions.

Currently, for example, the ordinance says children under 17 years old must be accompanied by parents to play on video machines in Canton Township.

Also, businesses must get an "ar-

cade permit" from the Township Board to operate four or more machines in their respective establishments.

To get this permit, a business must try to contact, and get signatures (pro or con) from all residents or tenants living within 1,000 feet of the business site.

Hemming requested the board discuss possible revisions to this ordinance in closed session to avoid the risk of potential litigation related to any amendment to this ordinance.

The board voted, 4-3, to go into closed session — trustees Robert Padgett, Steve Larson and Loren Bennett dissenting.

TOWNSHIP CLERK John Flodin said Hemming was asked after the closed session to rewrite the ordinance "to clear up some vague things and revise some undefensible items."

Padgett said he had no problem, legally, with going into the closed session, but was disappointed with the board's attitude on the issue.

### Recession sparks holiday depression

The holidays are traditionally a time for emotional highs and lows. Many celebrate the joys of the season, while others are left to the personal reflections of lost loved ones and the joys of seasons past.

The number of persons being caught in the depths of depression this holiday season has increased according to Plymouth-Canton area counselors.

"There's no question the community is experiencing lots of stress. I know from my own patient load it was difficult even for Thanksgiving," says Lillian Lerman, a family counselor who

practices in Canton.

The holidays are peak periods of depression, according to the Mental Health Association in Michigan.

"Although a source of happiness for many, Christmas and New Year's are also times of reflection and self-evaluation. To the depression-prone person, this often means looking back with disappointment at supposed failure and looking ahead with fear," says James F. Kipfer, executive director of the association.

"It seems that for this year we are seeing an increase in persons feeling a sense of loss around the holidays," says Diane Farber of Plymouth Family Service.

"Some of that has to do with the economic realities added to the emotional feelings. The economic conditions have put the damper on the festivities," says Farber.

Farber believes in the past persons have put a larger emphasis on the commercial aspects of the holidays, rather than focusing on the spirit of the celebrations.

Because of the current economic recession, many persons can't afford all the commercial trimmings they usually have and it's affecting how they view the holidays, says Farber.

"Spirituality isn't based on our mon-

ey. If it is, we need to question our society."

Persons experiencing a less joyful holiday season this year can improve their feelings with some of the suggestions from the Plymouth-Canton area counselors.

"The first thing we should do is to admit that this is a more difficult year. Then use that to become more creative in our celebrations," says Farber.

Being honest with someone about the different feelings brought on by the holidays can be a big lift, says Lerman.

### Fumes kill father, son

A Westland father and his young son died early Sunday morning, apparently from carbon monoxide fumes which seeped into their car stuck in a ditch on Yost in Canton.

A third occupant of the car, also apparently unconscious from the fumes, was pulled from the still-running car Sunday morning by Canton police and taken to Wayne County General Hospital in Westland.

Nancy Kennedy, 30, of Northgate in Westland, was released from the hospital Monday morning. Doctors were unable to revive her husband, James, 30, or their 3-year-old son, Wesley.

According to Canton police Lt. Larry Stewart, a Yost street resident saw and heard a car late Saturday night struggling to get out of a roadside ditch.

But by the time the unidentified resident went to investigate, the occupants had left the car, Stewart said.

The following morning, the same resident went back to the car, found it running and found the three occupants unconscious, according to police.

Police theorize the family left the car briefly after it became mired at a dead-end street but came back to the car after walking to a main road and seeing "nothing but open fields."

The car, a 1972 Buick, probably was turned off and on throughout the night to fight the cold weather and exhaust fumes seeped in through drainholes, Stewart said.

# Area cider lovers keep on sipping

The apple trees have given their all, and harvest season is over.

But local folks still have another month or so to sip freshly pressed cider and munch donuts at the Plymouth Orchard on Warren Road west of Napier.

David and Mary Emmett, who run the orchard, are hosting small groups of nursery-school and elementary pupils who come by weekdays for a one-hour tour.

The small fry (accompanied by parents) get a wagon ride to the orchard, a visit with farm animals and a snack of warm donuts and cold cider.

The Plymouth Orchard, now in its second year of operation, comprises about 100 acres on which nine varieties of apple are grown. The Emmetts have expanded their reception building, which also houses the cider press.

By next spring, the Emmetts hope to have 9,500 dwarf apple trees in the orchard — tiny trees which yield fruit and are easy to maintain.

The plan began in 1976, when the Emmetts bought an old farm and began clearing the land and planting the dwarf trees.

"WE HAD lived on Napier — around the corner," explained Mrs. Emmett, 35, a former dental hygienist. She was busy raising three children, but, "I didn't want to sit in the house for the rest of my life."

Emmett, 37, a former Livonia resident, works full time as an engineer for Hydramatic Division of General Motors Corp. in Ypsilanti. Much of the orchard's day-to-day operation is handled by his wife.

The season begins in late August, when the first crop of apples are ready for the U-pick operation. The cider shop will be open until Dec. 23, and customers may buy natural jellies and snacks, holiday gift baskets and fresh Christmas trees and decorations.

Much of the pressing is done after 3 p.m. or on weekends, when high school workers are available.

Apples are dumped into a bin and run through a washer. They then are mashed to the consistency of applesauce.

The final squeezing comes when the mashed apples are placed on wooden pallets, covered with cheesecloth and pressed.

The dwarf trees are pruned during the winter, and planting is done in the spring, Mrs. Emmett said. Family members all pitch in.

ON A recent visit, orchard employee Gale Blechschmidt of Plymouth talked to a group of excited toddlers and their parents from the Wayne Cooperative Nursery in Garden City.

Mrs. Blechschmidt explained that the orchard uses the small trees, which grow to a height of six or seven feet. The shorter trees make it easier for workers to pick apples and trim branches.

"The trunk tells the tree how tall to grow," Mrs. Blechschmidt said. "The branches tell what kind of apples are grown."

Chicken wires and a poisonous white substance are placed on the tree bark to repel hungry mice.

"I enjoy working with the tours — especially these young ones who pay attention," Mrs. Blechschmidt said. "I pattern my talk according to the age of the group."

Running a full-time orchard is hard work, but satisfying, Mrs. Emmett said. "You don't think about dollars (pay) per hours."

Hours are from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. during November and December. For information about the tours, call 455-2290.



## Hilltop decision postponed

Another chapter was added to the Hilltop Golf Course story Tuesday night when a final decision on the leasing agreement again was postponed.

However, the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees' decision didn't come before a few sparks flew amid the discussion of the tentative agreement.

While the details of the agreement reached by attorneys representing the township and course manager John Jawor weren't revealed, several points of interest were discussed before the tabling motion.

The issue was set aside because the trustees hadn't yet received the details of the attorney's agreement.

Trustee Joe West was assured by township attorney Charles Bokos that the proposed amendment to the contract would be given to board members prior to the Dec. 15 meeting.

This signals a possible end to the debate surrounding the course management and revenues paid to the township.

Jawor won the bid for leasing Hilltop in 1979. He offered the township 50 percent of the green fees revenue while guaranteeing a \$35,000 yearly minimum.

THE ORIGINAL lease with Jawor was based on the former nine-hole status of the course.

Since then, the course has expanded to 18 holes and experienced other interruptions caused by the construction of a sewer line and the loss of the clubhouse due to fire.

Subsequently, Jawor sued the township and among the provisions granted in an out-of-court settlement was an extension on his lease options until 1993.

With the course ready for 18-hole play next spring, the leasing contract is being amended to encompass the expansion. The board has been

waiting to take action on the contract addition while the attorneys hammered out a potential agreement.

DISCUSSION of the contract amendment focused on questions involving revenues and the addition of golf carts to the course.

Trustee Lee Fidge questioned the practicality of continuing the \$35,000 minimum when the course has doubled in size. She also questioned the verification used in determining the total green fees revenue.

"I think there should be a better accountability of the receipts, more than just the reports he gives the township," said Fidge.

Fidge suggested a monthly account of the gross receipts. Township Supervisor Maurice Breen said that would involve changing the original agreement.

Bokos conceded that the original contract "could have used stronger language" when outlining the accountability of revenues.

SOME BOARD members didn't agree with Fidge's desire to ask for a higher yearly minimum, claiming it was not needed since the township is guaranteed 50 percent of the green fees, if the course revenues exceed the minimum.

The township has budgeted \$100,000 in anticipation of the 1982 golf revenues.

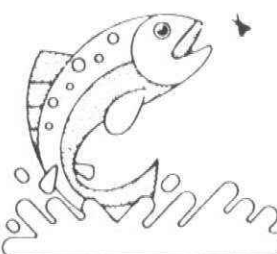
Yet Breen asked Jawor, who was seated in the back of the audience, if he would concede raising the minimum to \$75,000 at Fidge's request.

It was at this point the sparks flew. "If it would satisfy Mrs. Fidge's ego," Jawor said, in conceding to the \$75,000 minimum request.

Fidge replied she wasn't asking for the increase because of her ego, but because she felt there were problems with the contract dating back to when the board ratified it.

"I saw that the board had acted on an agreement which was already in effect," said Fidge.

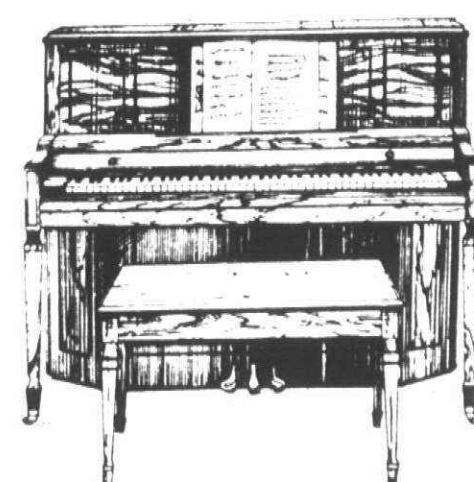

# Layoff leads to new golf shop

When Jim Paul of Canton was laid off by American Airlines after 15 years as an aircraft mechanic he refused to join the vast army of the unemployed.

Instead he took the "walking papers" as an opportunity to become his own boss and at the same time continue a hobby he had enjoyed for years.

As a result he has opened the Golf Shop at 875 Wing St., Plymouth, and spends his time repairing golf clubs — no matter what condition they may be in.

"I have played golf for more than 15 years," he said while preparing new shelves in the back room of the shop, "and I always repaired my own clubs."

"Then I became a member of the Godwin Glen club in the Michigan Public Links Association, and played in all sections of the state."

"The other golfers looked at the job I had done for myself and they soon trusted me with repairing their clubs, too. And playing around the state in the public links affairs gave me the exposure I needed. So being laid off wasn't so much of a jolt it would have been to many of the others."

As he began building the shelves he confided that he had been repairing golf clubs for some time. He did it as a part-time job while working for the airline.

With a smile he admitted that he couldn't put extra yards on your drive or straighten out any of your wild putts, but he could put your club back in the shape it was when it was purchased.

Looking at a cluster of clubs waiting his attention Paul said that of all the clubs being manufactured he preferred to work on the McGregor products.

"Many of the people with whom I play became dissatisfied with their drivers. When this happens they want them wrapped differently. Others want the club head changed. But there is always work of repairing clubs. So, I figured being laid off from my mechanic's job was just the chance I needed to go into business for myself."

Although only 37, he recalls that wooden shafted clubs used to be the vogue. Then, some years ago, the steel shaft was introduced and he was emphatic in saying that the steel shaft was the greatest thing that ever happened to golf equipment. He didn't mention the wedge which also has been a boon

to the ancient game.

At the moment he is making old clubs look like new — and there is a

large number awaiting his attention. now that the golf season is about at an end.

"I have a rather strong, personal objection to going into closed session," Padgett said. "I don't like to go into closed session unless I'm convinced in my own mind to do so."

"In this case, in my opinion, I didn't see a clear need to go into a private session to discuss it."

Padgett said, however, that certain items discussed in the closed session "certainly were related to potential litigation" concerning an ordinance revision.

BEFORE THE MEETING, Township Supervisor James Poole told the Observer the board must make clear, important decisions on this

ordinance — especially concerning the age of video operators, when they should play on these machines and how many machines businesses can operate.

"If they let up to 10 machines in Canton (for each business), this will be the arcade of the midwest," Poole said.

"I have a big problem with 10-year-old kids playing in an arcade until 10 p.m. And you know any parent who lets his kid out at that time isn't waiting to pick him up."

"They don't let a 10-year-old play the slot machines in Vegas, but at least, there, they'd have a chance to get their money back. The only purpose these machines have is to take the kid's money."

"Talk with a good friend or family member about the sadness or feelings of loss."

Taking part in the traditional celebrations which aren't expensive is a positive step, Lerman says.

"Preparing holiday foods, going to religious services together or visiting persons who would appreciate the visit can lift spirits."

Getting out with other persons can be a big help, according to Dr. Douglas McClellan, a Plymouth psychologist.

"The people who are really the saddest are the scrooges. But as you set that aside and take part in the festivi-

ties, everyone benefits," says McClellan.

The counselors also suggest persons should be sensitive to those feeling low around them.

"People who aren't depressed should make invitations to those not partaking in the joys. We should make an effort to understand those who might not seem to be enjoying the celebrations," says Lerman.

Some of the indicators to look for, according to Farber, are persons who are isolated, withdrawn or not talking about holiday plans.

"Reach out to these people, so that everyone has an enjoyable holiday," says Farber.

## Halim in legal limbo

# Jury deadlocked in conspiracy trial

Aslan Halim, a Plymouth Township resident who owns a bar in Westland, remains in legal limbo.

A jury in U.S. District Court Monday was unable to reach verdicts on cocaine conspiracy charges against him.

Judge Avern Cohn declared a mistrial after jurors told him they were deadlocked on all three charges brought against Halim during trial.

Halim, one of six defendants tried in the conspiracy case, was charged with conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute cocaine, aiding and abetting with intent to distribute cocaine and unlawful carrying of a firearm during commission of a felony.

Joseph Papelian, a U.S. Attorney,

said the federal government plans to bring Halim to trial again on the charges.

"Right now, we intend to re-try," Papelian said. He indicated that the jury had been 11-1 for conviction. "He's still under indictment," Papelian said.

Four of five defendants tried with Halim were found guilty and one was acquitted last week. Jurors took a long Thanksgiving weekend and returned Monday to determine Halim's fate.

They were unable to do so.

After three hours of deliberations, the jurors informed Cohn they were deadlocked.

Cohn ordered them back for more deliberations, but declared a mistrial

shortly thereafter when it became apparent they were still deadlocked.

**EARLIER**, Dan Bagbey, an officer in Westland's 18th District Court, was found guilty of conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute cocaine.

Robert Cox, a Westland firefighter, was convicted of conspiracy, two possession charges, a distribution charge, an aiding and abetting possession charge and an unlawful carrying of a firearm charge.

Glenn Gatt, a Westland resident, was found guilty of conspiracy and four possession charges.

Adalgiso Mancini of Plantation, Fla., was convicted of conspiracy.

Gatt's attorney, Philip Doherty, said he plans to appeal the convictions of his client.

"I think Mr. Gatt should not have been tried with the others," Doherty said. The attorney added that the evidence presented by the prosecution may have led jurors to believe that Gatt was more involved than he actually was.

Doherty also said that a plea bargain

worked out with the U.S. Attorney, fell through because Gatt "would not admit to involvement that (Anthony) Berna said Gatt was involved."

**BERNA**, who was originally indicted on several charges relating to the conspiracy, pleaded guilty to conspiracy charges and was given a two-year prison sentence.

Berna then testified for the prosecution against the others.

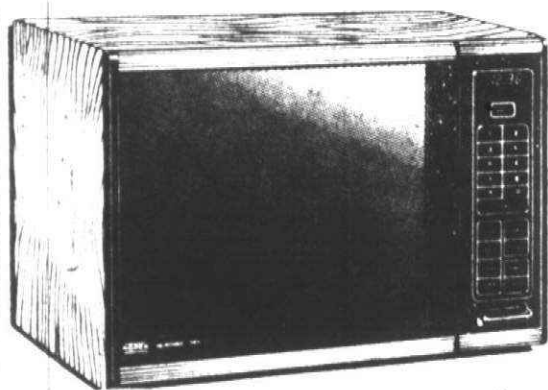

A court ruling against southeastern Michigan suburbs in the longstanding dispute with the Detroit Water Board "definitely should be appealed," said Livonia Mayor Edward H. McNamara.

McNamara, who has fought since 1975 against rates charged 96 suburban communities which buy their water from Detroit, declared "we continue to regard the imposition of higher water rates for non-Detroit residents, who pay two-thirds of the total revenue for this vital service, as unnecessary, unfair and illegal."

He said he would convene a meeting in mid-December of all mayors and ex-

ecutives of the 96 suburban communities to report fully on the judge's decision and to discuss their next course of action.

WEXFORD CIRCUIT Judge William R. Peterson ruled "this court cannot say that the rate of return on extra-city sales ... was unreasonable when the evidence showed rates in excess thereof being allowed to regulated utilities in Michigan during the same period."

Peterson added that "the fixing of such rates is a legislative matter with which the courts will not interfere unless the plaintiff shows that the rate de-

termination was arbitrary, capricious or unreasonable."

The ruling, according to McNamara, "overlooks the inherent injustice of a 35 percent rate increase amounting to \$14 million per year voted by the four Detroit commissioners in 1975. At that time, the water budget showed a \$15 million surplus, and a balanced budget was passed by the board without the necessity of a rate increase."

McNAMARA WAS the Wayne County suburban representative on the Water Board until he was fired on Oct. 2, 1975 by Mayor Coleman Young for

criticizing water department policies.

Afterwards, McNamara enlisted the support of more than 90 suburban communities to file a class-action suit challenging Detroit's action in establishing water rates on a so-called "utility basis," which includes a "return on investment" — or profit.

The suit sought to require the Detroit Metro Water Department to develop standards for further rate increases, claiming the 1976 increase was unnecessary and represented overcharges to suburban users.

## Working: Changes and choices

# Growing work force seeks more flexible schedules

Have you ever felt you were on a treadmill going from school to work to retirement with no stops along the way?

Have you ever wished you could arrange your life differently, to include more vacation time or leaves for further education or travel?

Have you ever had to cope with overly rigid worktime arrangements to accomplish family or personal chores?

If you have these feelings, you are not alone. Such concerns have become commonplace. As a result, major changes in the ways we distribute work over the days, weeks and years of our lives are already occurring.

**WORKTIME** arrangements in the future are likely to be considerably more diverse and flexible than in the past, allowing individuals to work in ways that better meet their needs and preferences.

Traditionally, if one held a job, one worked 40 hours a week for approximately 40 years sandwiched between schooling during youth and retirement in old age.

Today, managers and employees alike are questioning the viability of such standardized worktime arrangements and our prevalent education-work-retirement lockstep.

**THIS MOVE** toward more worktime flexibility is rooted in fundamental social changes in education, family life, retirement and employment.

Less and less do we follow the traditional practice of gaining all of our education during youth. A 20-year-old today can expect to live another 55 years,

as compared to 42 years in 1900. Thus the idea of recurrent education throughout life has become increasingly reasonable.

In addition, almost one-third of today's workers change their occupations every four years. The need to adjust skills in response to social and technological changes — coupled with growing interest in recreational education and the recognition that "real world" experience augments formal school — is encouraging youth to interrupt school with employment and adults to break from work for education.

**CHANGING FAMILY** patterns are also increasing the demand for worktime changes.

Until recently, traditional family values encouraged men to hold full-time jobs as "breadwinners" and women to forego or minimize employment in order to perform full-time "homemaking" duties.

Today, husbands and wives are increasingly sharing income-earning and, to some extent, homekeeping responsibilities as couples have fewer children and women pursue careers or take jobs to help meet family expenses.

As more of us become members of dual-earner households, the task of juggling home and career will necessitate more work-scheduling flexibility in order to meet individual needs.

Additionally, family time constraints when both spouses are employed will foster a desire to forego earnings in exchange for time off. Despite the pressures of inflation, increased earnings from two pay checks will commonly create the financial discretion to trade earnings for time.

**ANOTHER LIKELY** change will be the flexible extension of employment

into the later years of life.

Life expectancy for those aged 65 has increased from 13 to 16 years since 1940. Thus, the need to spread fixed incomes and savings over longer retirement years — together with improving health and progressively less toilsome work — may cause many individuals to hold jobs past the traditional retirement age.

Indeed, population trends indicate that public and private pension systems must support a growing number of retirees in the future. The resulting sparsity of money may make it necessary for persons to work past 65.

In response, older workers are more likely to seek less than full-time employment or extended leave options as a price for postponing retirement.

Other worktime reductions may result from high unemployment. In the past, social policies to shorten the workweek, prolong schooling during youth, and lengthen retirement were instigated partly to spread jobs among more workers.

Despite these and other policies, joblessness remains unacceptably high, and policy makers are exploring ways to spread unemployment by further reducing worktime.

**THESE DEVELOPMENTS** are all contributing to one of the most profound labor market trends of our era: The size of the labor force is skyrocketing, but a growing proportion of this expanding labor force would prefer to work less than full time.

The proportion of all adults seeking or holding jobs has increased from 60 percent in 1960 to 64 percent in 1980

and is projected to top 66 percent by 1990. At the same time, aspirations for reducing worktime and scheduling it more flexibly have also increased.

According to one representative survey in 1978, 59 percent of American workers would trade from 2 up to 50 percent of current income for more free time — if they could choose the type of time off.

Similarly, 84 percent would exchange all or some of a 10-percent raise for more free time.

Other studies indicate overwhelming desire for more individual choice in scheduling daily and weekly work hours.

One survey found that 79 percent favored overall life scheduling that would mix schooling and leisure into mid-life rather than compartmentalize such non-work time into youth and old age.

**WHILE STANDARDIZED** worktime routines continue to dominate the world of work, innovations that were unheard of a decade ago have become commonplace.

The proportion of employees voluntarily working part-time has increased from 11 to 19 percent between 1954 and 1977. In the past, most part-time jobs were temporary, low-skilled positions.

Today, increasing numbers are career-track jobs that allow individuals to fluctuate between full- and part-time while gaining seniority and promotion.

"Job-splitting," where two persons share one full-time position, has become common and has proven successful for high school principals, line administrators, and other positions requiring complex tasks.

**FLEXTIME**, which allows employees to arrive at and leave their jobs late or early as long as they put in a full day's work, is used by an estimated 13 percent of American employers.

In Europe, the flextime concept has



been expanded to the week, month and year, allowing employers to avoid overtime pay rates while meeting the preferences of employees. Modified workweeks, such as four days of 10 hours each, are frequently observed.

Although comparatively rare, sabbaticals and leave-of-absence rights have emerged outside the academic world.

Many private firms in the labor-competitive electronics industries have developed three- to six-month paid sabbaticals as an effective means of recruiting and retaining employees. Leave-of-absence rights up to one year are now common in the public sector.

**AMONG THE MOST** interesting innovations are voluntary worktime reduction programs.

One California county allows individuals employees to forego 5, 10 or 20 percent of their annual earnings for 10, 20, or 40 days of additional vacation.

This popular program was originally started as a voluntary work-sharing scheme to avoid layoffs. During its first year, 18 percent of the county's

10,000 employees freely exchanged pay for time, thus reducing overall labor costs and avoiding layoffs.

In some cases, similar programs have actually increased the number of jobs by making it necessary to hire replacement workers.

**ANOTHER NOTABLE** approach to combating joblessness is Work Sharing Unemployment Insurance.

This program, which has been used for 50 years in Germany and was recently initiated in California, allows payment of partial unemployment insurance for employees who go on shorter workweeks to prevent layoffs.

No one is laid off, workers retain most of their take-home pay and fringe benefits, and employers avoid expensive recruitment and training costs.

Like all changes, these worktime innovations have costs as well as benefits.

Nonetheless, these institutional changes are gradually redistributing work, not only among different groups in our society, but across the days and years of our lives.

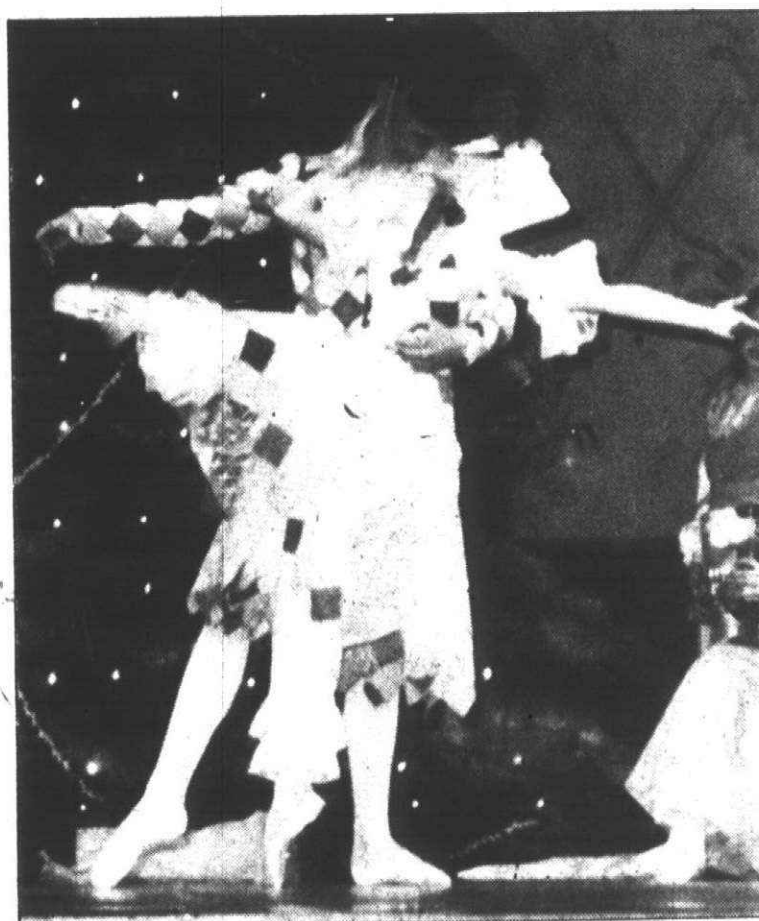

# Firm publishes workbook with tips on re-employment

A three-volume workbook has been published by a Plymouth consulting firm on how to assist employees about to be laid off and how individuals may prepare for re-employment.

The workbooks cover the subject of outplacement management, an emerging topic in human resource management dealing with terminated employees.

The material is being published by Fred DeRoche, vice president, and Mary McDougall, senior associate, at Odiorne International, Inc. — a Plymouth-based management consulting firm.

Volume I is "The Career Transition Workbook: A Guide for Outplaced Employees."

Volume II, "The Outplacement Administrator's Manual," is geared to the on-site program administrator.

Volume III, "Human Resource Planning for Consolidation," is designed for the human resource planning specialist.

"Our goal was to fill a void we perceive in the human resource management literature," said DeRoche. "There is very little published other than a recent surge of journal articles. Little material is available to assist the terminated or outplaced employee in becoming successfully re-employed."

"Program administrators and human resource planners have been forced to meet the economic conditions of the past few years without prepara-

tion or practice," added DeRoche.

Included are suggestions on staffing and orientation training, preparation of terminated employees, training sessions for salaried and hourly employees, marketing of employees, using recruiters, and evaluating program results.

Volume III on human resource planning consolidation presents an action plan to be used by the human resource specialist when the manpower supply is high and the demand is low.

The major activities outlined include manpower demand/supply forecast, review of termination policies, decision analysis to reduce, close or maintain operations, staffing of outplacement/retirement program, security system analysis, internal relocations and reassignments, identification of employees for termination and retirement, announcement of plant closing/work force reduction, implementation of outplacement/retirement counseling training center, utilization of government and community agencies, marketing assistance for outplaced employees, and program evaluation.

Volume I on career transition was not intended to duplicate existing job hunting materials, said DeRoche, but deals with specific needs of the terminated employee as identified in the firm's counseling program.

Besides seeking a new job, said DeRoche, the laid-off individual must cope with the issues of forced unem-

ployment. That person may consider early retirement as an option.

If the person involved is a partner in a two-career family, added DeRoche, another set of issues are present.

Geographic relocation may become a necessity for unemployment depending on conditions of the local job markets. Finally, the employee must learn how to establish and maintain a new career position.

"The book was designed to be used by the individual as a practical self-help workbook where little or no assistance is provided by the employer. It also can be used by trainers/counselors as a text in conducting a training program," said McDougall.

McDougall said that the second volume is a practical hands-on guide for the manager who coordinates the in-house outplacement/retirement counseling/training program. It demonstrates how to plan and implement a successful program by using proven materials, she added.

"We are convinced that outplacement as a newly accepted human resource management practice will grow dramatically in the next few years," said DeRoche.

"As an industry the growth is forecasted at \$25 million in 1980 to more than \$100 million by 1985. Our efforts in this new discipline have been sys-

tematically organized and developed and are now available to the market."

Douglas G. Lerner of Canton has been appointed director of the Michigan Osteopathic Medical Center (MOMC) Child and Youth Mental Health Hospital.

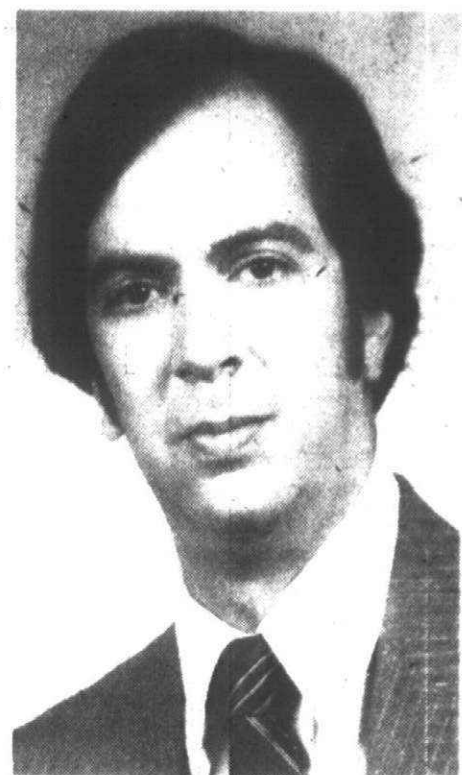
Lerner previously was an administrative specialist in MOMC's corporate organization planning department. He also has been MOMC's manager of policies and procedures.

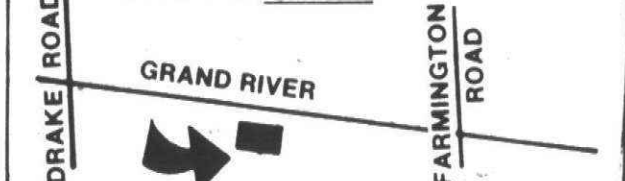

# Two state records for one angler

Q. What do you call a master angler with two masters' awards?  
A. Michael Miller, 25, of Westland.

The local fisherman has collected two state fishing records in the past year, according to Ron Spittler, district fishery biologist for the state Department of Natural Resources.

One was for a five-pound, four-ounce gar pike which Miller caught May 25 on a silver jig at Newburgh Lake, Livonia. The other was a 14-pound dogfish he took July 19 on a Mepps spinner at Crooked Lake, Brighton.

Granted, the gar and the dogfish are "rough" species and not considered the most palatable. But you may remember the name of Mike Miller, 34233 Spring Valley, from a couple of seasons ago, when we reported he was awarded two Mepps certificates. One was for a seven-pound largemouth bass taken from Newburgh Lake, the other for a 53-pound salmon taken below the Ausable River dam in Oscoda.

"About 100 times a year," he said when asked how often he fishes.

That way, he said, he learns the "really good spots" on any lake or river he tries.

His other secrets are hardly earth-shattering. "Evening and early morning," he said about fishing times. "Fishing Facts magazine" was the answer to where he gets his best information.

Miller likes Newburgh, the local impoundment of the Middle Rouge River, for crappies; Island Lake near Brighton for perch during winter; Woodland, also near Brighton; and other local spots.

One favorite catch was the 37 1/2-pound muskie he extracted from the Detroit River last year using a two-pound-test line.

Question: How do you land a 37 1/2-pound muskie on a two-pound-test line?

Answer from a double master angler: "Very carefully."

HURON-CLINTON Metroparks are selling 1982 vehicle entry per-

• "Snowshoe Tying Workshop" runs from 1-5 p.m. Sunday, Dec. 6 at Oakwoods Metropark, south on I-275 near Flat Rock. Naturalists Bob Wittersheim and Mike George will supervise. Prices are \$34 and \$39 for a kit of the Ojibway (Chippewa) Indian design, which features ash wood frames and nylon cord webbing. Bindings are not included. Century 21's Cutright dies suddenly at 49

Richard L. Cutright, the man responsible for building Century 21 Real Estate into the largest real estate franchise operation in Michigan, died unexpectedly Sunday. He was 49.

Services for the Livonia resident were Wednesday at St. Maurice Catholic Church in Livonia. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, Southfield.

Several persons who worked closely with Cutright throughout his career said the organization's state president and chief executive officer was a wonderful man with a huge heart.

"HE WAS A great guy who would help anyone get started," said Jim Courtney, one of Cutright's colleagues.

"When I started with him in 1967, he co-signed my first car loan. He was a person who was concerned and caring and never had a bad word to say about anyone," Courtney added.

"He helped me find a career in real estate."

CUTRIGHT BEGAN his real estate career at 19. He opened an office called Hartford Real Estate Co. on Schoolcraft and Telegraph in Detroit, Courtney said.

During the next 23 years, Cutright opened 12 Hartford offices in metropolitan Detroit. In 1974, he sold them to Century 21, a subsidiary of Trans World Corp.

"There are now over 290 Century 21 offices in Michigan, and Dick is responsible for founding all of them," said Harold Waldfogel, controller at the Southfield office where Cartright worked.

There are more than 7,000 Century 21 offices in the nation.

# To seek understanding Learning Disabled attend college

Thirteen people came to the Schoolcraft College "rap" session. No one was visibly impaired.

Yet three of the 13 who snuggled down into the comfortable armchairs had a hidden handicap.

Tim Slater, a second-year student at Schoolcraft, began to tell of the frustration of being a learning-disabled student. His face reddened as he talked.

"Teachers don't understand how a disabled student learns. Teachers think it is unfair to the other students to have a test read. They think they are giving away answers."

SLATER'S frustration, along with the frustration of all other learning-disabled students, was the main reason for the meeting of the 13.

College officials, instructors, a parent and three students had been brought together that morning by the Michigan Association for Children and Adults with Learning Disabilities (MACLD) and the Schoolcraft College Learning Assistance Center to talk over how colleges could help more fully the learning-disabled student.

Colleges represented at the meeting were Schoolcraft, Madonna College of Livonia and Henry Ford Community College, Dearborn. Association adviser Edith Gbur represented MACLD.

As snowflakes fell outside the window, first Slater, then Brian Gbur, Madonna College sophomore and son of Edith Gbur, and then Nancy Leeper, also a second-year Schoolcraft student, opened up to the group.

"Students don't have the courage to talk to teachers and tell them of their learning problem," Gbur said. "The learning-disabled are afraid. They know they are different from everyone else, so they keep everything inside. It

only makes the problem worse. If Gbur halted, searching for other thoughts. Ms. Leeper came to his aid. "People look upon you as being less of a student," she said.

TWENTY-TWO years ago, few educators knew much about learning disabilities. Those who had trouble reading were sometimes labeled "mentally retarded."

Then in 1959, the Berkley School District started the first class in Michigan for elementary students who had learning problems. The Birmingham and Farmington districts soon followed.

Today, special help for the learning disabled in grade school, high school and college is written into federal law. Many colleges now operate learning centers, giving students help in reading, writing and note-taking.

But as the students' words slow, there is still a wide gap between students who have trouble learning in the traditional way and teachers who know only how to teach in the traditional way.

A LEARNING disabled student is neither blind nor hearing-impaired. He or she is neither mentally retarded nor emotionally impaired.

The learning problem lies "in some area of the perceptual process," according to MACLD.

For the learning-disabled, "one or more of the basic processes involved in understanding or using spoken or written language" goes awry. The disabled may have normal or above-average intelligence. Some give the appearance of being hearing-impaired or having visual problems, but they are not.

William Baumgartner, a Schoolcraft electronics instructor, came to the meeting struggling with a question other teachers also probably struggle with.

"As an instructor, I have to be fair to all students," Baumgartner said. "Do I put all students under the same requirements or set individual standards for each student?"

Sirkka Gudan, director of Schoolcraft's learning assistance center, told Baumgartner how learning-disabled students want to be treated.

"They don't want standards adjusted for them," she said. "They want teaching ways adjusted."

Some untraditional ways to teach the learning disabled suggested by the group were tape recorders, tutors, note takers and oral tests.

DR. HUGH WATSON, an assistant professor at Madonna, took Gudan's answer one step further:

"This is a problem the learning disabled deal with all through school. It relates to the degree of visibility of the handicapped."

"It's like the mother who always wondered why Johnny was not like everyone else and couldn't read," Watson said. Watson coordinates Madonna's dean's grant program of federal aid to comply with laws regarding education of the handicapped.

Slater can't read in the traditional way because he has dysgraphia. Written tests baffle him. If he must read, he puts so much effort into just getting through the words that he can't comprehend their meaning.

So his mother and his girlfriend read to him. He also sends textbooks for upcoming semesters to a New York firm for taping.

Yet Slater also flies an airplane and scuba dives, a sport which requires a knowledge of physics. His diving instructor read him his diving test to him. But, Slater said, aviation officials won't do the same, so he has yet to get his pilot's license.

TO CAROL CHAPMAN, teacher consultant for the South Redford School District, not being able to read is a tough obstacle when the "whole school system is based on reading."

"To me," she said, "content is more important than how the student gets it. But teachers still want to put a student out on the farm if he is hard to teach. They ask, 'What are you doing here?'"

That is called "rigidity," responded Watson. "It's trying to get students to do things the way society or tradition demands."

The group agreed that a good way to change society's perception was to change the words learning-disabled. Watson suggested "special learner" or "learning different."

MS. LEEPER told the group she has had trouble reading, too, but "supportive parents" and a lot of determination have kept her in college with high grades.

She recalled the day in junior high when someone told her she should not consider college. "That man made me more determined than ever," she said.

How much responsibility does a teacher have to turn a student away from a career he can't handle, Baumgartner asked.

Teachers can't be paternalistic, Watson quickly responded. The learning disabled, he said "have as much right to try and fail as anyone who comes to school. We can guide, but we must preserve their right to reach out."

Slater, like Ms. Leeper, is fiercely determined to succeed. Yet he said one of his greatest fears was what would happen to him once he got out of school and got away from the special help given him at Schoolcraft.



# Auto, construction chiefs talk tough on labor costs

Getting labor costs in line is the automobile and construction industries' top priority for 1982.

And the companies made it clear Monday they intend to do that during 1982 contract talks. Spokesmen for Ford Motor Co. and Association of General Contractors were among five speakers who appeared before the Detroit Economic Club.

Contracts in both major industries expire in 1982 — construction in summer and autos in September. At full employment, automobile manufacturing employs 390,000 Michiganders and construction 140,000.

"WE'VE GOT to get our labor costs in line with foreign producers and in line with the rest of the U.S. manufacturing sector," Ford Motor Co. President Donald E. Petersen said. Labor and management must "bite the bullet" together.

Petersen said top goals are 1) to reduce absenteeism, medical leave and paid personal holidays and 2) to get more productive work for the company's money.

Petersen emphasized the necessity for U.S. car manufacturers to compete with the Japanese.

"We have to reduce the Japanese cost advantage, which is now \$10 an hour. It's an advantage that allows the Japanese to produce and land an

Escort-size car in San Francisco for \$1,400 less than we can make it here," Petersen said.

FORD WANTS to provide jobs in this country. But if it can't compete on a worldwide basis and get labor costs in line, the industry will be forced to move its production lines elsewhere, he said, adding:

"That's not a threat, it's an economic reality."

"If we have the good will to work together, the long-term outlook is very promising. Management is willing to bring to the table some new ways of looking at employee compensation, so employees can share in the good times just as we ask them to sacrifice in bad times."

CONSTRUCTION MANAGERS look to unified bargaining during 1982 negotiations with the major building trade unions.

"We have it within our power to reform the collective bargaining process without the help of government," said O.L. Pfaffmann, president of the Association of General Contractors of America.

"What we need is intelligent local bargaining which will reflect the total cost of the contract and produce non-inflationary settlements without strikes," he said.

During 1981, the Greater Detroit

Construction Employer Council, a construction managers association, restructured its bylaws, so its negotiators have power of attorney.

"Now they (negotiators) can make a decision for the whole industry right at the bargaining table. That makes it a unit and gives the council more clout," said Frank Kruce, council director.

THIS COLLECTIVE bargaining concept was enacted in 1970, but has never been as strong as projected for 1982, Kruce said. Contracts with 45 trades will expire this summer.

"The real importance of this unit is to have solidarity. If we do have strike, then let's have it industrywide. Then

people will stick together."

At the luncheon, Pfaffmann quoted the national AGC president who said at a recent AFL-CIO meeting, "While the industry was changing rapidly, the institutions of labor and management have remained unchanged. We must realize that we are at a major turning point. The incentives of the past 10 years have all failed. The internal joint activities of labor and management needed to be streamlined and reformed."

We're working for reform, Kruce said and noted that the council-all trade bargaining technique is already widely practiced in Chicago, New York and Philadelphia.

## Chiefs predicting auto industry survival

A leaner American auto industry will survive and prosper, but not in the first half of 1982, says the president of Ford Motor Co.

And a leading regional banker adds he can't call the economy "sick," despite continued high, long-term interest rates.

Ford President Donald E. Petersen and Detroit-bank Corp. President Donald R. Mandich were among five speakers Monday who told the Detroit Economic Club the southeast Michigan economy wouldn't improve until the second six months of 1982.

PETERSEN SAID the No. 2 auto maker has reduced salaried personnel levels 25 percent in its

North American operations.

The key to auto recovery, he said, is whether interest rates drop sufficiently.

"If the economy is growing at a 4 to 5 percent rate, and if the prime (rate paid by strongest corporations) is below 15 percent, we should have a new car sales rate of over 10 million units and truck sales of more than three million units," he predicted.

"The potential longer-term outlook — beyond 1982 — could be much more encouraging. The tax cut will spur capital spending. And reduced government regulation will have an enormous long-term impact."

"Given a healthy economy, I believe that be-

tween now and 1985, we will see a more than 16 million combined new car and truck sales year."

BUT IF auto makers are looking to a big drop in interest rates next year, the banker wasn't predicting one.

"I believe the economy will be doing quite well in the third and fourth quarters of 1982. By late 1982 or early 1983, I would not be surprised to see the prime rate again at about 18.5 percent," said Mandich.

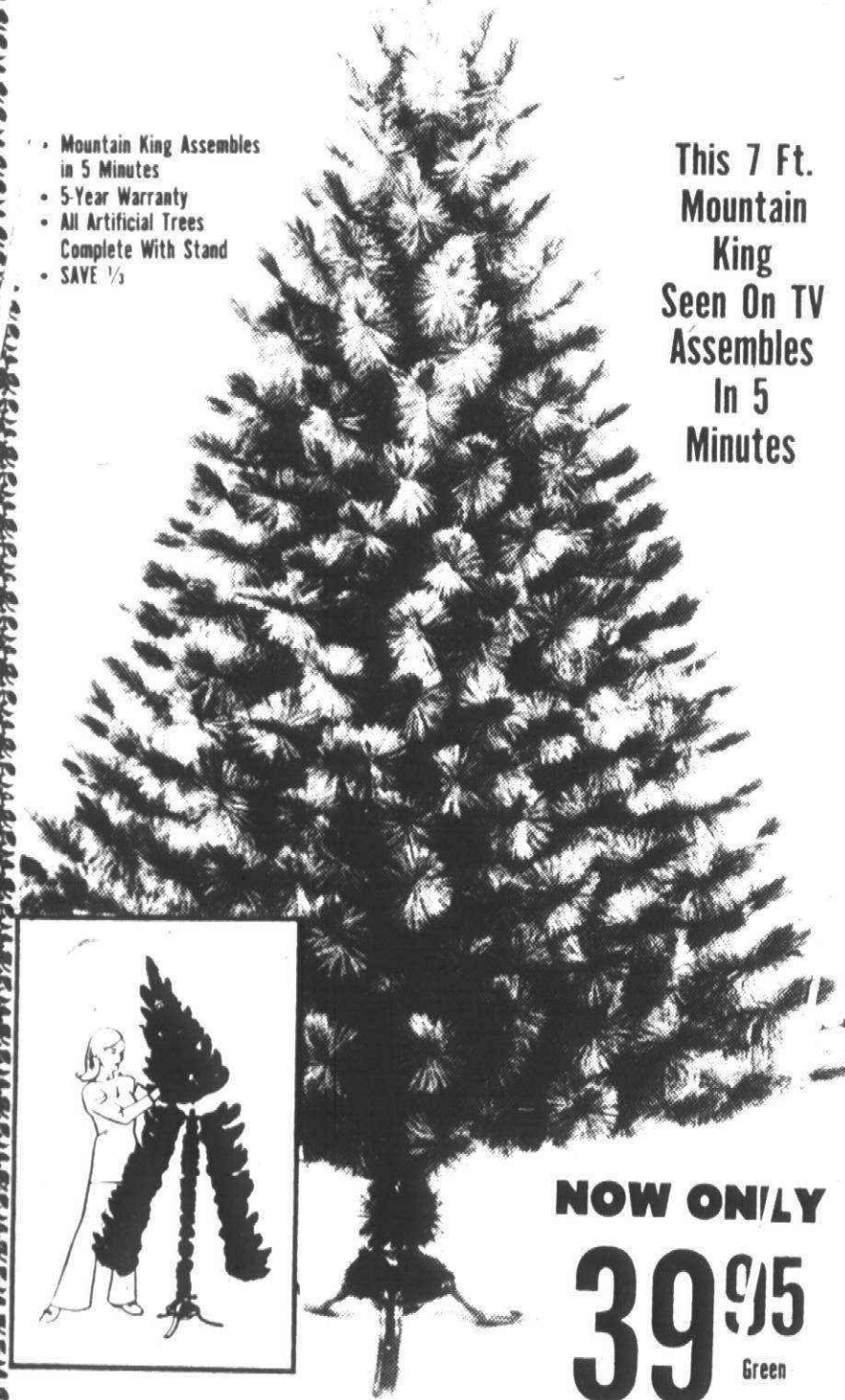

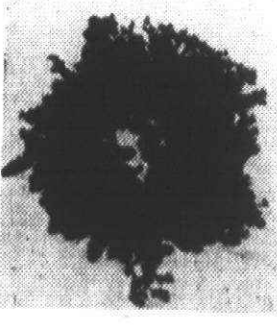

# For construction, 1982 is still cloudy

The construction industry will most likely be the last to pull out from under the recession's dark clouds, and it probably won't be until 1983.

"Our industry is in real trouble," said O.L. Pfaffmann, president of the Detroit Chapter of the Associated General Contractors of America.

"We've had unemployment levels of nearly 30 percent for all trades; dollar volumes are down some 35 percent across-the-board, and construction's share of the gross national product has declined from 10 percent to less than 7 percent," he told the Detroit Economic Club Monday.

While most industries are projecting better times for the second half of 1982, construction leaders are more pessimistic.

"It is very questionable that any improvement will be realized during the first half of 1982, and not much significant change is anticipated in the sec-

ond half," Pfaffmann said.

**CHALLENGES WHICH** builders face in 1982 are high financing costs, needed legislative reforms and government spending for public roads.

"Next year's biggest loser will continue to be public works," he said. Michigan's Department of Transportation confirms our highways and bridges are in need of repairs and maintenance. Michigan Road Builders Association has recommended some legislative action. By changing our road tax rates assessments system, it would bolster sagging revenues caused by decreased auto usage and better gas mileage," he added.

Pfaffmann looks to the state and federal government to help finance major public improvements, such as pipelines, waterways, sewers, utilities, bridges and highways.

"ALL OF THESE areas should be receiving some consideration from both state and federal governments, particularly now with the present economic condition," he said.

When builders talk about recovery, interest rates are always a topic.

"The big question in our mind is, what is the magic interest rate that will trigger construction activity across the board?" Pfaffmann asked.

# Why economic picture is so confused

Not until 1983 will the Michigan economy recover. At least that's the view of University of Michigan economist Joan Crary.

Her pessimistic predictions continued with the comment, "The state outlook appears nothing but bleak." She was one of the co-authors of a research paper called "Michigan Economy in 1982" which was presented at the University of Michigan's 29th Annual Conference on the Economic Outlook.

At the same time, stories have been appearing in newspapers indicating that interest rates are dropping. The inflation rate is falling. Home sales are improving.

SO WHAT the hell is going on? Is the economy getting better or worse?

The truth is that no one knows. Sometimes it seems professional economists are the most confused.

People make the mistake of thinking that economics is a science. That is, if A and B happen, then C will result. But economics is an art, not a science.

Anything can happen.

At best an economist can consider some specific factors — perhaps inflation, unemployment and interest rates — and guess what will happen in the future. But no one knows how any one of these factors will react in the future or how they will interrelate.

At worst, economic forecasting is no more reliable than gazing into a crystal ball.

BUT THERE'S another element more important than inflation, unemployment or interest rates. What do people think is going to happen to the economy?

There's a self-fulfilling prophecy aspect to economic forecasting. If people think a recession will get worse, they won't buy. That makes the recession deepen. If they believe things are going to improve, they will buy. A recession is then ended earlier.

So what do people think on the main streets of Plymouth, Garden City, Farmington and Birmingham?

Frankly, the signs are not good. People are frightened. Larry Sherman, president of the Birmingham-Bloomfield Chamber of Commerce, says this year is the most uncertain of the 23 years he has been in retailing.

"The marketplace is inconsistent," he said. "We have a couple of good months, then business can be bad. It's just not predictable."

Another sign of the economic times is that in Farmington, the Goodfellows have seen a 40 percent jump in the number of needy families receiving Christmas baskets.

More than 250 families in that city will get baskets this year. "People find it hard to believe that there are that many needy families in the Farmington area," said Richard Tupper of the Goodfellows.

EVEN THOUGH University of Michigan economists predict an improvement in 1983, it may be short-lived. This recovery will not signal a permanent solution to the state's economic problems, they say.

Joan Crary said the improvement will provide breathing space in which workers, employers, the universities and officials of the state can jointly work for a stable state economic base.

That sounds fine. But so far, people in this state have not demonstrated an ability to work together.

Forgive me, but I'm pessimistic about workers, employers, etc., all working together to improve the state's economic climate. For decades, people have realized that the state must diversify its dependence on the automobile industry. So far there has been much sound and fury, but little action.

## Here's lesson from poll and Chaucer

The best research, they say, confirms what you already knew. Three samples came my way in the last week.

One was a poll published Oct. 11 by the Des Moines Register of 1,022 persons aged 18 and older, which makes them voting age.

The pollster showed the persons five paragraphs, including articles from the U.S. Constitution on the right to bear arms, freedom of speech and the right to be secure in one's home, along with the proposed Equal Rights Amendment.

ERA, you'll recall, has been bogged down in the process of being ratified by two-thirds of the state legislatures. Offhand, you might guess ERA would be unpopular.

Not so. Those three little lines drew the most support of the pollster's five samples. Something like eight persons in 10 supported equality of rights without regard to sex.

I FOR ONE was not surprised. The notion of equal rights makes such inherent sense that one wonders what the debate is about.

But I note a little ruefully that from time to time high school kids take similar polls and show people sections of the Constitution protecting the freedom of the press. In those polls, freedom of the press doesn't do well.

The existing Bill of Rights, including freedom of religion and press, was passed in the 18th century, the most enlightened and progressive the world has ever known.

It's too bad the supporters of ERA didn't raise the issue in 1787. It would have passed a whole lot faster than it's moving today.

THE SECOND bit of research came in the Courses by Newspaper series we are running on "Working: changes and choices." In part 7 (Nov. 19), Barbara Lazarus wrote:

"In 1928, the average woman worker was 28, single and a high school graduate. Today she is 36, married, and the more education she has, the more likely she is to be working for pay."

"By the end of the 1980s, it is expected that close to 70 percent of all women will be working."

"Most women today work in the lowest-paying occupations. The average woman's earnings are less than three-fifths of the average man's."

"More than 400 occupations are listed by the Bureau of the Census, but most women are employed in 20. One-fourth of all women work as secretaries-stenographers, bookkeepers, elementary school teachers or waitresses."

Paragraph after paragraph follows in the same vein.

THE FINAL reading came from a 14th century gem called "Canterbury Tales" by Geoffrey Chaucer. Each character gives a personal spiel, called a prologue, before telling a story.

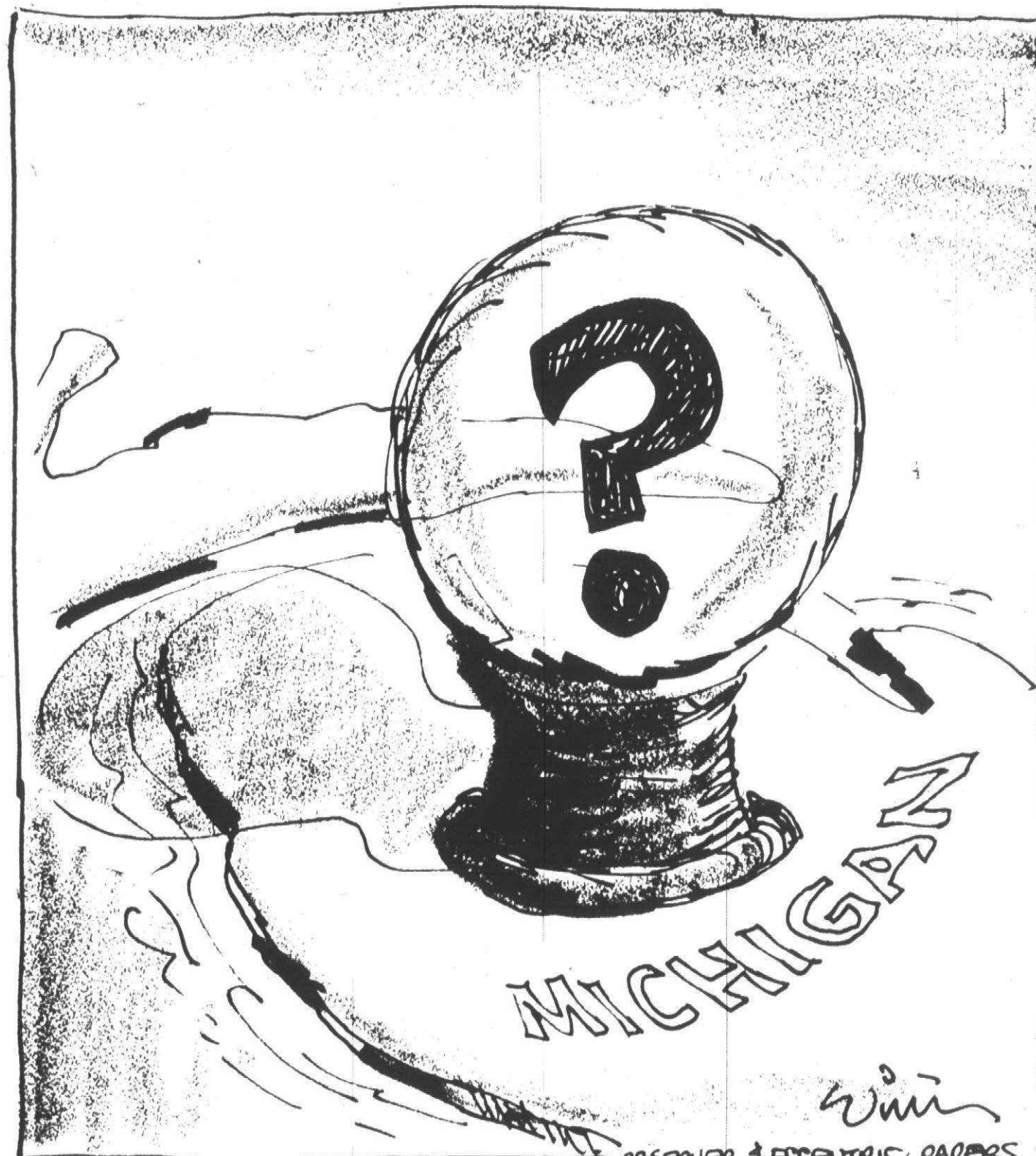
One of the most lovable characters is the five-times-married Wife of Bath. For six centuries, she has brought smiles to readers with her forthright defenses of marriage, remarriage and the marriage bed, as well as with her ability to manipulate her successive husbands:

*In wifehood I will use my instrument  
As freely as my Maker has it sent.  
If I be niggardly, God give me sorrow!  
My husband he shall have it, eke and morrow,  
When he's pleased to come forth and pay his debt.  
I governed them so well, by my own law,  
That each of them was happy as a daw . . .*

It's good literature, good fun. But in the real world, described by Barbara Lazarus, it's not enough.

In the real world of today, it seems to me, women would be better off with a little constitutional protection than by emulating the medieval Wife of Bath.

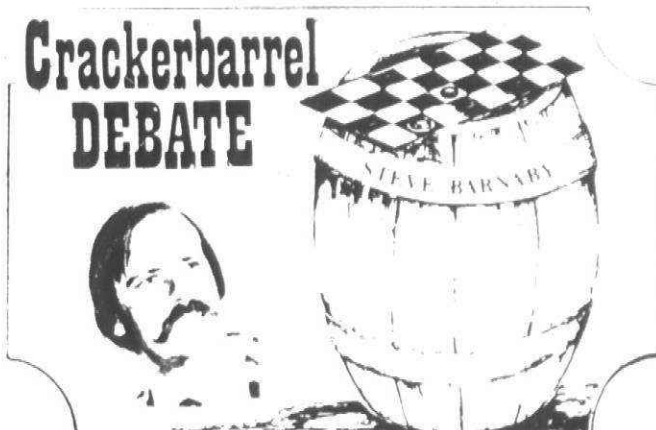

What a bunch of baloney! But that's the kind of garbage being written about our area. Certainly, we all realize that we are in a less than enviable economic position.

But East Berlin? C'mon.

Obviously, we've got a big job ahead of us to sell our fine state to outsiders, especially when you've got some guy floating around who thinks Dallas is better than Detroit because he got a free bag of hamburgers down yonder.

Sure, lots of us are leaving for better climes both economic and environmental. So what?

FRANKLY, I'M glad to see residents who need to leave, departing. No sense in having a lot of people hanging around doing nothing. It wouldn't be the first time this country has experienced migrations.

Recall, please, how in the '40s millions migrated north to work in the auto plants. The rest of the country survived — it really did.

Even better, recall how folks in the '60s ran from Detroit to Phoenix. Now look at that place: It's a mess. Pollution is high and crime is rampant. But I wouldn't say it's another Pompeii. Phoenix, like many other parts of the nation, is joining the community of cities which has problems.

Certainly, it will take Southeast Michigan another decade to recover from our present economic hardships. But just think what a nightmare it will be to live in Dallas or Houston in another 10 years.

All those people and all those police to pay to protect them from each other will cost a pretty penny. And we all know what happen to cities which are without zoning laws — urban havoc.

Even I shudder at the thought of all those unregulated highrises.

So welcome, Texans, to Michigan. I promise, we'll all smile while we're taking your money.

I might even go out and buy a Stetson and a pair of Dinges, thank y'all.

## Camera can be artist's tool if you see ahead

Even though photography has been around for about 150 years, only within the past decade has it been accepted as a true art form with collections to be found in major museums throughout the world.

This is proven not only by public appreciation of a photograph but by the economic impact of photography in the marketplace.

For instance, Ansel Adams' photographs, which today sell for many thousands of dollars, commanded only \$100-\$200 a decade ago. Why does his work demand such high prices? Because the public accepts fine photogra-

phy and people are willing to buy it.

**OBVIOUSLY**, not all photographs are considered great works of art and are worth little except perhaps to the person who shot them.

But the important thing I want to convey to you is to develop a state of mind that your photography can be important, that taking pictures can be an art, and that as a person deeply interested in photography, you are an artist. You paint with light, and your subject is life itself. What a wonderful opportunity to create!

How can you begin to think of yourself as an artist? First, by likening

yourself to a sculptor. A sculptor begins with a block of stone, his whole. By chipping away with a chisel, he ends up with his finished work. Thus, by process of elimination, a sculptor derives his completed art.

Similarly, a photographer, too, derives his finished work by process of elimination and by zeroing in on his subject. An initial look at the subject is the photographer's "whole." Then by proper lens selection, camera angle, light direction, selective focusing, time of day, et cetera, the photographer "chips away," like the sculptor, and ends up with his finished art.

Even film choice and paper selection are important for the photographer to express himself artistically. Remember, also, that it isn't the chisel carving the stone — it's the sculptor. Similarly, bear in mind that it's not the camera making the photograph — it's really you.

**LEARNING TO VISUALIZE** in advance is very important in your photography and will help you to think in terms of an artist. When you are composing a picture in the viewfinder, try to visualize the image as a finished print. This is especially true for those who work in black and white, where an interpretation of tones and contrasts is necessary.

Even when you don't have your camera with you, train yourself to look at things as if you were seeing through a viewfinder. You'll be amazed at what you will see.

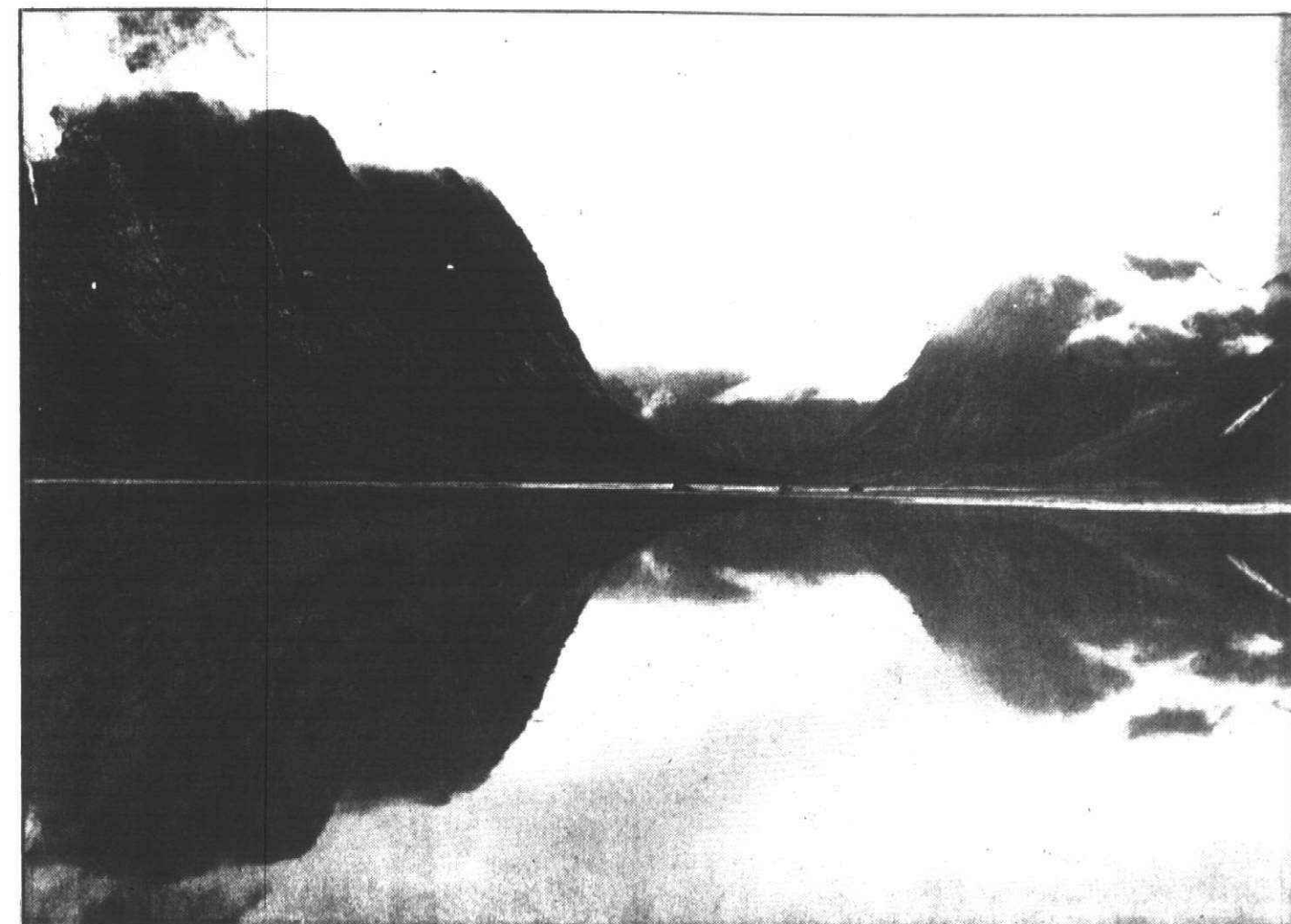
Yet another way to bring out the artist in you is to try to say in your photography how you feel about your subjects, remembering that you and your subject are the two most important ingredients in making a photograph.

If you love trees, for example, communicate this love through your photographs. Try to make a meaningful statement about trees in your pictures.

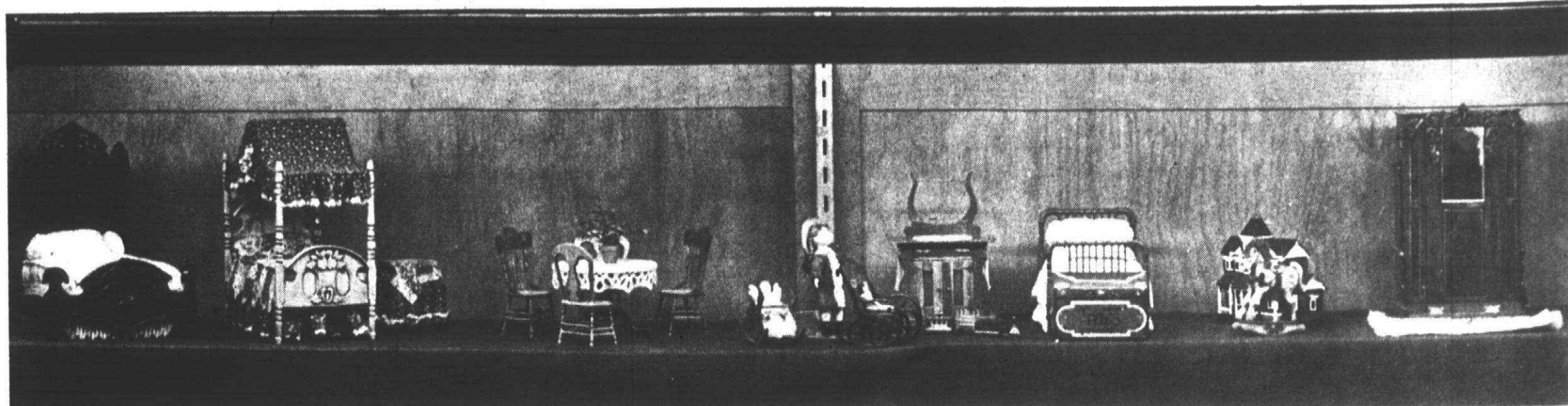

## Miniatures star in museum's Christmas show

The Plymouth Historical Museum has been converted to a magical Christmas village. Victorian rooms and shops present a pageant of the holidays — as they were.

Visitors will walk through Plymouth of an earlier age, with horses and sleighs coming up Main Street and children dressed in long coats and caps. A peek through shop windows reveals toys of long ago — miniature steam engines, wooden rocking horses and fragile porcelain-head dolls.

Popcorn and candy canes, gingerbread men and colorful ribbons brighten evergreen trees and boughs throughout the museum. Christmas wreaths hang in quaint shop windows and doors. An occasional stocking can be seen hanging by a fireplace.

**SPECIAL EXHIBIT** for the season is a collection of doll houses and miniatures.

On loan for the holidays are the wonderful miniatures of Judy Shellhaus of Plymouth Township and Winnie Arnaut of Plymouth. Their miniatures usually highlight displays at the Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village where they teach the art of recreating scale models of antique furniture.

Each piece has an original. "All of the originals exist somewhere," said Mrs. Shellhaus as she pointed out a bed modeled from one in a London museum. All her wood carvings are done with just two tools, a jig-saw and an Exacto knife. All the spindles are hand-carved.

They weave cane seats from dental floss. They make their own miniature wicker furniture.

Arnaut and Shellhaus have been making miniatures for seven years. Each is a limited edition.

**THE DOLL HOUSE** village represents the work of several area residents.

The gazebo in the town square represents more than 200 hours of work — so far. Mrs. Shellhaus says it isn't finished. She also has a saloon and a Victorian house in the exhibit. The Tudor house belongs to Jan Cummings. Connie and Don Masson of Canton have loaned their doll house to the collection. The church was made for a Chicago bishop about 40 years ago. Charles Schaffer of Drummond Island made

the two stone houses for his granddaughters.

There are all styles of houses in the village, from southern plantation to cupboard style. There is an exact replica of a local Hough Woods house.

**THE MUSEUM** has arranged a special Christmas walk from 7 to 9 p.m. Friday, Dec. 11. Walkers will visit three historical houses in Plymouth before going to the museum for a tour and refreshments.

Limited tickets are available for \$4 advance sale and \$5 at the door. Tickets may be purchased in advance at the museum, 155 S. Main Street, the Green Thumb, 470 Forest Place Mall; and Lorraine's Dolls, 615 N. Mill Street, Plymouth.

For those who cannot attend the walk, the museum is open from 1 to 4 p.m. Thursday, Saturday and Sunday. Admission is \$1 for adults, 50 cents for 12- to 17-year-olds, and 25 cents for children 5 to 11.

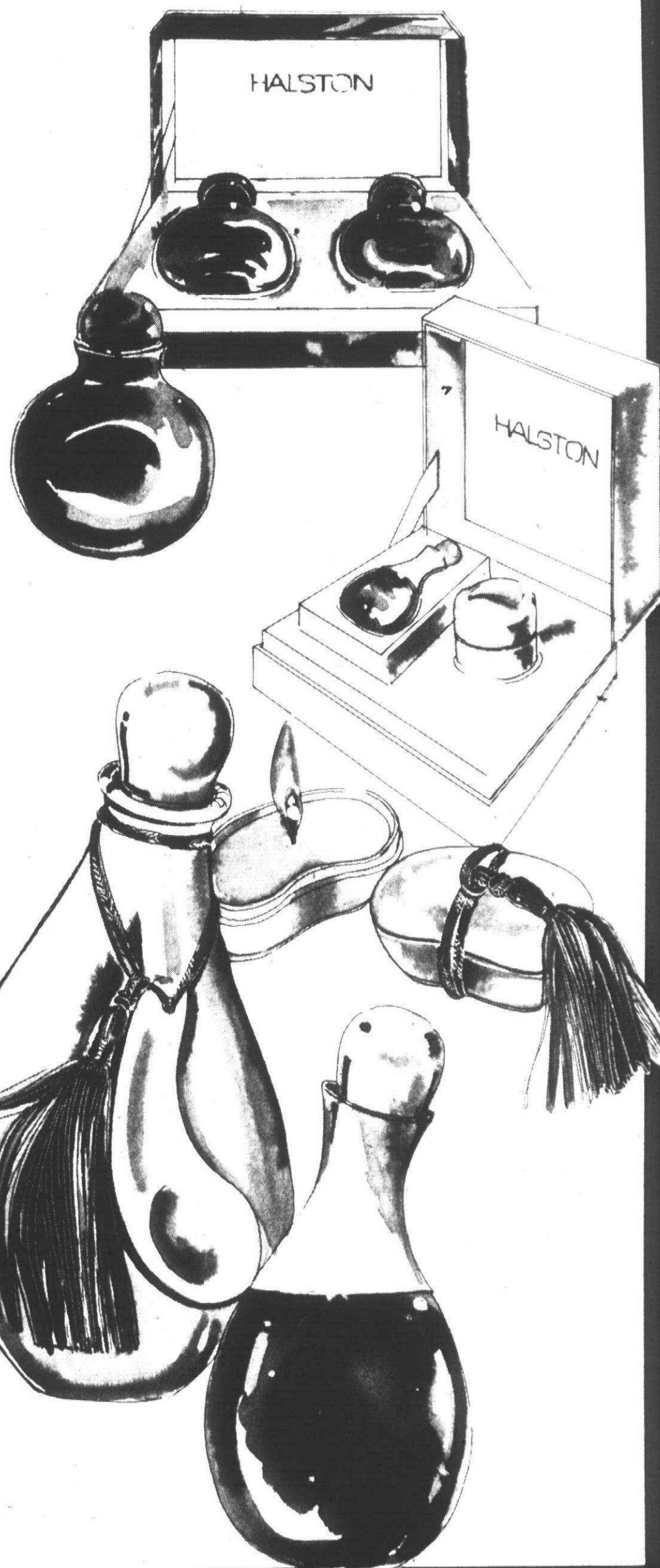

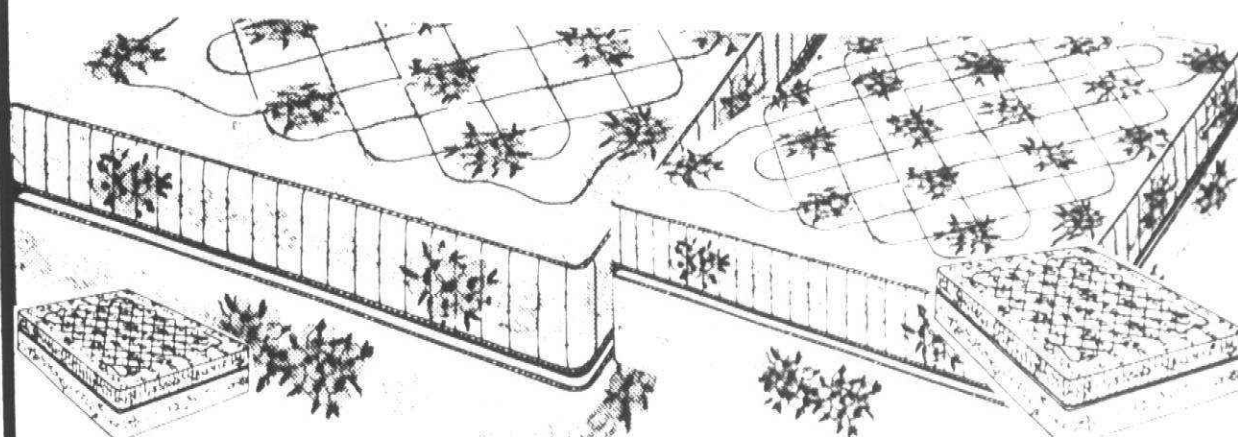
Members of the Family Life Committee are involved in the production and will host the receptions following the performances.

# Search for roots begins in mountains

The floor is several feet down as Jerry Jumba executes a jump for a Carpatho-Rusyn dance.

It's a long way — in both miles and experience — from the harsh Carpathian Mountains of western Czechoslovakia to the sanctuary of Sacred Heart Byzantine Catholic Church of Livonia.

But the cultural gap, at least, has been closed a bit since Jerry Jumba visited the local congregation. Its members now have some knowledge of water sprites and wooden churches and Holy Supper and the pysanky of the eastern mountain people who were their church's forefathers.

Jumba is a Carpatho-Rusyn and tremendously proud of his heritage. Some of those in Sacred Heart parish also are of that ethnic group, but don't know much about their heritage. At least, they didn't until Jumba came recently as an emissary from Bishop Emil Mihalik to conduct for the Sacred Heart people a week of workshops about their little-understood, often misnamed and misspelled ethnic group.

One of the frequent mistakes is to translate Rusyn into Russian. The ethnic groups are not the same, although they have similar origins, according to Jumba.

Some 50-60 church members and friends attended the seven workshop he led concerning Carpatho-Rusyn language, background, crafts, dances, folk songs and holiday customs of the Slavic group.

Among them were Nick and Mary Nagrant of Farmington Hills, Rose Kobylanz of Livonia, Ailene Karlewski of Redford and Detroiters Mary Lejer, Richard and Elaine Baranko and Stefan Klinczak.

And all feel a little closer now to the heritage that tends in

this country to be glossed over or forgotten because it isn't understood.

SOME OF WHAT they learned from Jumba was history. The Carpatho-Rusyns, he explained, have lived for some 11 centuries in the rugged mountains that are found, as he put it, "where East meets West."

"There is an amazing story," Jumba told the present-day representatives of those people. "They could not defend themselves from all sides, so they had to be stoic and accept their political fate."

But through pride in their heritage they kept alive customs and language, he added.

Primarily shepherds, farmers, loggers and farmers, they endured a rugged land and resisted constant pressure for political assimilation.

In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, many of them joined the Slavic migration to the United States.

The settlements were mainly in Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey and Ohio, but some came to the Detroit area where St. Nicholas Byzantine Catholic Church was their worship place.

That church eventually moved to the east side of the city, and in the 1960s, Sacred Heart found its place in Livonia.

OF COURSE, noted the Rev. Thomas Chelena, current pastor of Sacred Heart, the congregation now isn't all of Carpatho-Rusyn heritage. "With moving around and intermarriage, it's probably a small percentage," he said.

"But everyone has enjoyed learning about the ethnic beginnings of the church and the Carpatho-Rusyns.

Jumba, who comes from Pennsylvania and is a music teacher by profession, is visiting various churches in the Byzantine Catholic Diocese of Parma.

Coming from a family that "enjoyed and shared its ethnicity," he called himself "the only professional Carpatho-Rusyn cultural worker in the United States."

Interest and years of study have given him the knowledge to lead the bishop's cultural roots program.

He noted that information about the Carpatho-Rusyn heritage is so diffuse that most people don't even try to understand it.

"They will say 'I'm Slavic,' or 'My ancestors lived in the Carpathian mountains,'" he said.

"But there is a distinct culture here, although for centuries it was always dominated politically, and now at last we are able to make a presentation and share it."

"If people can find the roots of their heritage and express it more clearly, hopefully they can pass it on to their children. Americanization is a fine thing, but we're trying to achieve a balance."

IN GIVING seminars in Byzantine churches, Jumba showed crafts and taught songs and simple dances. He also demonstrated the more taxing leaps and jumps that find their way into Rusyn folk dancing, and he showed the people of Sacred Heart pictured examples of the wooden churches their forebears had been famous for building.

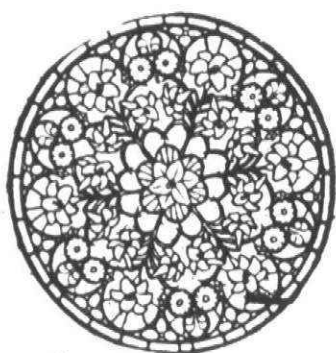

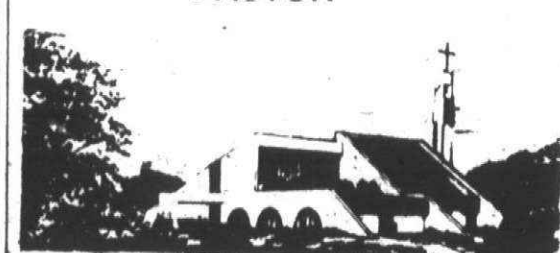

# The Lincoln Trail

A trip through history for the holidays

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS began to twinkle along the Lincoln Heritage Trail (LHT) this week, as the holiday season was launched nationwide. Yuletide attractions along the trail are only a few of the seasonal events that travelers can use to light up their lives on the road between now and the New Year.

The Lincoln Heritage Trail is a 2,200-mile marked route that meanders through the most important locations in Abraham Lincoln's life, from his birth in Kentucky, through his boyhood in Indiana to his grave in Illinois.

The LHT is marked along regular highways by large reproductions of a Lincoln penny. These signs are posted by the Lincoln Heritage Trail Founda-

tion, a non-profit group promoting both historic and commercial tourist attractions along the route. A main trail and an alternate route are marked in each state.

Kentucky's main trail includes year-round attractions such as the Lincoln Birthplace State Park in Hodgenville, My Old Kentucky Home State Park in Bardstown, Shakerstown at Pleasant Hill, and the Mary Todd Lincoln House in Lexington, as well as the cities of Frankfort, Lexington and Louisville.

Louisville has a bang-up Christmas celebration this weekend, Dec. 3-6, including a downtown schedule of tree-trimming, caroling, ice skating, a Christmas ball and house tours.

A holiday market, featuring Phyllis George Brown and the Kentucky Guild of Artists, will be held in Lexington

Nov. 14-16 at the Lexington Center, Heritage Hall East.

On the Indiana main trail, you can visit the Lincoln Boyhood National Memorial and State Park, with its living farm, in Lincoln City; the Lincoln Museum, with its collection of original Lincoln photographs, and more than 10,000 Lincoln books, in Fort Wayne; Lincoln Pioneer Village in Rockport; Santa Claus Land in Santa Claus, near Evansville; and the cities of Fort Wayne and Indianapolis.

At this time of year, many of the Christmas attractions are in the cities. Indianapolis celebrates

Christmas at the Zoo Dec. 4-11, and Christmas at the Indiana State Museum Dec. 6, with an Ethnic Christmas at the Children's Museum through Jan. 3.

**THE INDIANAPOLIS** Museum of Art sponsors Christmas at Oldfields, a 19th century celebration, Dec. 11-27. A Christmas Candlelight Tour of eight decorated historic buildings takes place in the city, 4-8 p.m. on Dec. 13.

You are also invited to the Christmas Ball in historic New Harmony, 4-8 p.m. on Dec. 13.

The Lincoln Trail Monument, just across the Wabash River, which forms the southern border of Indiana, is one of the most interesting of many monuments along the Lincoln Heritage Trail.

It marks the place where the Lincoln family entered Illinois during Abe's boyhood and points towards two historic sites: the Lincoln Log Cabin State Park and the Lincoln Douglas Debate Site in Charleston; and the Lincoln Trail Homestead State Park in Decatur with its replica of the cabin where the Lincolns first lived in Illinois.

**ONE OF** the most colorful Christmas attractions occurs Dec. 5-6 at Lincoln's New Salem Historic Site in Petersburg, where a New Salem Christmas is celebrated in a restored village where Lincoln once lived.

The ladies bake, churn and spin; the cooper tends his barrels; the blacksmith pounds his shoes. School is in session and the carolers wander the village streets.

This weekend also launches the Annual Christmas Poinsettia Show at Glen Oak Conservatory in Peoria, which continues through December. Candlelight tours in Peoria also, Dec. 4-6 and 11-13.

Everything on the Lincoln Heritage Trail points towards Springfield, of course, where Abraham Lincoln lived, practiced law and is buried.

**THE LINCOLN** Depot Museum, and the sound and light show, are available only in summer, but you can visit the old and new state capitols, Lincoln Home Area, law offices and grave year-round.

Lincoln's Tomb State Memorial seem like a fitting end to the trail. Here the children have rubbed the bronze statue of Abe Lincoln to a shine. They leave pennies in the bronze vests of small Lincoln statues around the grave site.

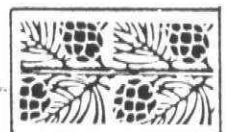

Redford Union's Cinderella story ended abruptly, even rudely Tuesday.

The Salem victory sets up a third match with Livonia Bentley, this one to decide the regional championship. Bentley's only loss this season was to Salem, a setback the Bulldogs avenged later in the season by defeating the Rocks. The regional final will be at 7:30 p.m. Thursday at Thurston.

The outcome of the RU-Salem game was never in doubt. Salem methodically chewed up RU, scoring the first five points. By the 3:50 mark of the first quarter, all five Salem starters had scored to give the Rocks an 11-2 advantage.

The Rockslide never let up until RU was buried deep in a 20-point disadvantage at the half and 34 points after three quarters.

"PLYMOUTH SALEM is the best team we've played all season," said RU coach Terri Ann Anthony. "They're very disciplined. Speedwise and fundamentally, they're the best in the state."

RU was not expected to give Salem much of a tussle. The Panthers won only four of 19 regular season contests but surprised everyone by winning their district. Still, Salem coach Bob Blohm said his team wasn't looking past the game to the matchup with Bentley.

"When you play this far into the state tournament, you have to play each game before thinking about the next one," Blohm said.

If Blohm hasn't thought of a way to beat Bentley, he won't have much time to do it. He admitted, "I don't know how we're going to do it — but it'll be fun trying."

"I don't think there is a better team in the state," Blohm said of Bentley. "(Kim) Archer, (Lori) Swanson and (Ann) Roy are tremendous rebounders. It's hard to keep them off the glass."

"It'll take a tremendous defensive effort."

SALEM ISN'T going into the Bentley game without hot hands of its own. Blohm said his team was "really at the top of their game" against RU.

One of the interesting features of the game was that it pitted two of the area's best shooters against each other — Cathi Hengy of RU and Jan MacKenzie of Salem.

But that showdown fizzled, as neither played more than 2½ quarters, although for different reasons. MacKenzie was red hot from the outside, canning eight-of-13 field goal attempts to lead Salem with 18 points. She left when Blohm went to the bench midway through the third quarter.

Hengy had a different type of night. It was an inglorious finish for the sharpshooting senior guard — she hit only one of 12 floor shots, scoring five points before fouling out midway through the third quarter.

Jacque Merrifield added 11 points for Salem. RU was led by Wreni Mountford and Lori Pagoda, each with six markers.



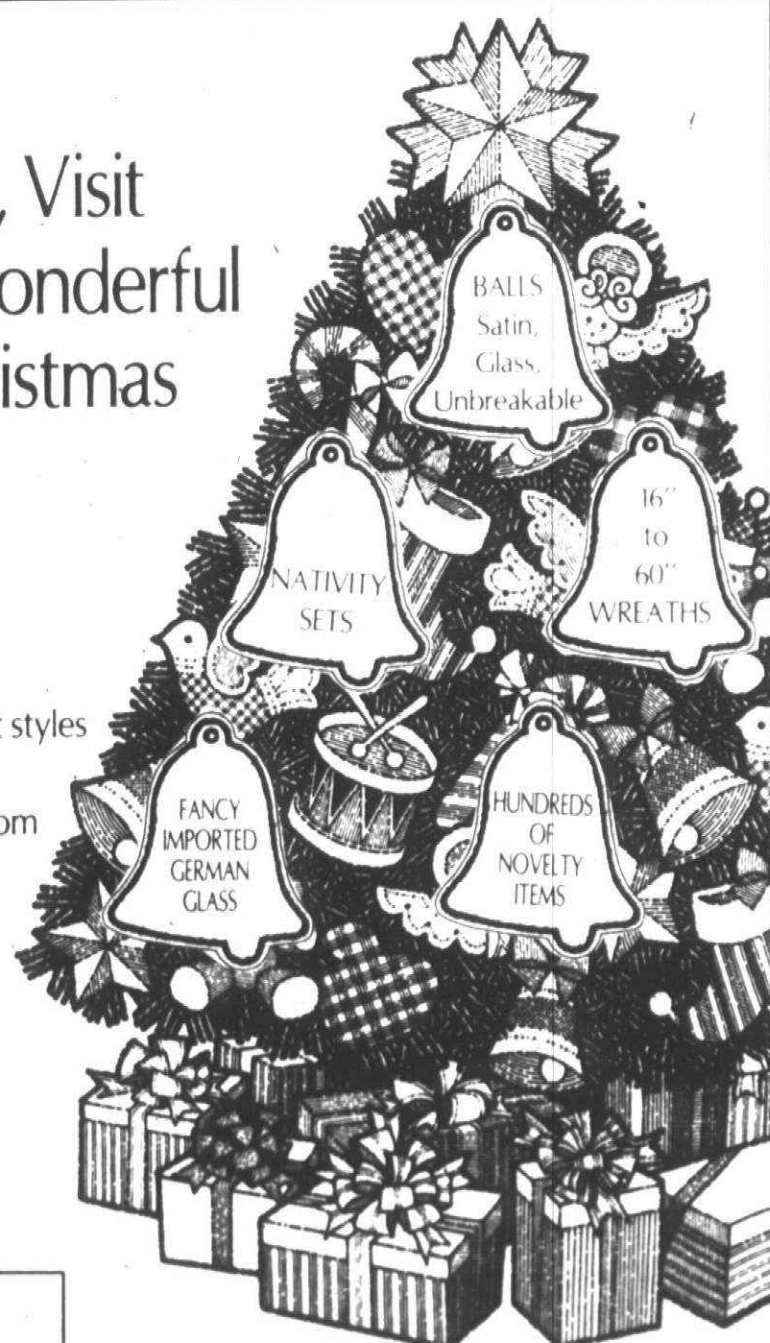

# Designer genes fit future tennis queens

It was hard to tell which was better — the pedigrees or the tennis — the last few days at the Franklin Racquet Club in Southfield.

The club hosted the United States Tennis Association's national indoor championships for 12- and 13-year-old girls, which is why the tennis was so good. After all, these are, or hope to be, the Tracy Austins of the future, (though when Tracy won the title in '74 and '75, everyone was trying to be the new Chrissy Evert.)

As for the pedigrees, well, tournament tennis may not be the sport of kings, but neither is it the sport of peasants or knaves.

Though a Korean-American named Grace Kim won the tournament, and there was an occasional black on the court or a name like Raka Raychaudhuri on the tournament board, this event seemed largely a gathering of next-generation preppy leaders, from Palos Verdes, Calif., to West Bloomfield, to West Palm Beach.

THEY CAME FROM around the country — 96 of the best young girls in the U.S., to spend Thanksgiving vacation kicking off the 1982 tennis season. Many came with parents or coaches.

They came with reputations and computer rankings based on careful scrutiny of their performances as 10 and 11 year olds.

They came with two-fisted backhands, calves muscled like weightlifters, precision strokes, blistering serves and enough gear to start a mail-order tennis business.

They came with solid histories as overachievers and superkids who are mostly the children of overachievers. Wonderful genes beget wonderful genes, whether you're talking apples or aces.

Her are some passages from the USTA's program:

"Melissa Brown, Scarsdale, New York. Melissa . . . participates in the girls recreational soccer, basketball and softball leagues. Melissa enjoys downhill skiing and her ceramic sculptures have been shown in local exhibits.

"Cammy MacGregor, Palos Verdes, Calif. Cammy . . . loves all competitive sports as well as horseback riding, skiing, golf and bike riding. As a member of the National Charity League, she spends many volunteer hours participating in philanthropic activities.

"KRISTIN LYNCH, West Bloomfield. Kristin . . . is an honor student whose favorite school activity is drama. Kristin enjoys . . . basketball, gymnastics and softball. Kristin has a younger brother who plays tennis and baseball and a dog named Nipper." (How one plays a dog, I have no idea.)

"Kathy Mulvehil, San Diego. Kathy . . . is a straight A student, whose favorite subject is mathematics. Kathy is a member of the Citizenship and Scholarship clubs at school. She has taken three years of French and plans to take a trip to France this summer with her school. In her spare time, Kathy plays the piano." (Spare time?)

"Grace Kim, Ridgewood, N.J. She is an honor student in the eighth grade,

but most of her subjects are of ninth-grade skill. Skiing and playing the piano are her alternate hobbies . . . Grace envisions herself as a mixture of doctor, veterinarian, tennis pro and even an author in future years." You get the picture.

THESE GIRLS DIDN'T get to the nationals because of money, though many of them wouldn't have gotten there without it. The silver plates for the winners go nicely with the silver spoons many of them were born with. The lessons, court time and travel expenses to tournaments take plenty of money.

But it also takes tremendous dedication to be as good as these girls are as young as they are. Two-fisted backhands the way tiny Melissa Gurney, the

runner-up to Kim, hits them are a product of thousands of repetitions.

Melissa, a tiny 12-year-old Californian who is a competitive middle distance runner in her spare time, has been hitting backhands since she was four.

"Now all she needs is to grow," said mom of Melissa, who gave up five inches and a year and a half to Grace. "We didn't expect her to win. But she played with composure. She is young in the body, but not in the head."

Maybe that's what is disconcerting about these kids. They all seem so young in the body but so old in the head. So mature. Maybe that's a product of having a goal early in life and working hard to achieve it. Or maybe it's from growing up watching Chris

Evert play. Whatever, these girls play like machines.

Kim, in particular. She is certainly a millionaire of the future on the women's tour. She hits a driving serve that is nearly impossible to follow and plays with confidence, savvy and killer instinct. She is in total control out there, of her opponent and of herself.

Kim, the 13-year-old No. 1 seed who finished 13th a year ago, won six straight matches in the tournament without losing a set.

Remember the name: Grace Kim. WENDY GILLES. Remember that name, too. Gilles is from Plymouth and is the younger sister of Chris Gilles, who played in this tourney last year and finished the 1981 season as the nation's 21st-ranked player. Wendy, 13, was ranked 24th after last season and was seeded No. 2 to Kim in the Franklin tournament.

Gilles won two matches, then lost to Melissa Brown, the No. 9 seed who ended up third. Gilles finished 17th in singles and, with partner Kathleen Monczka of Okemos, fifth in doubles.

Gilles and Monczka were eliminated in the semifinals by Cammy MacGre-

gor and Stephanie London, who went on to the doubles title. Gilles is better than she showed, though she'll have to wait till next July to get another shot at a national title.

Michigan was well represented, with 13 players, including Kristin Ashare, the younger sister of Erin, the state's Class A singles champion from Bloomfield Hills Lahser; Paige Plummers of Troy; and Kristin Lynch of West Bloomfield.

THEN THERE WAS Clare Evert. She's Chris' sister and she would have been No. 2 ranked except she does most of her playing in Florida and doesn't come north to tournaments.

All of which helped Kim, though the way she played, it's hard to imagine anyone beating her. Kim had extra incentive. Daddy, who stayed back in Ridgewood, promised her an early Christmas present of \$1,000 if she won the national tournament.

That "and a week off," added Grace. "A week off, that's what I want more than anything."

"I gotta play tomorrow," answered a friend enviously. The \$1,000 hadn't impressed her. Clearly, the week off had.

on the team in tackles and first in assists.

## FIRST TEAM OFFENSE

**Rick Wilson, Westland John Glenn, quarterback.** Several schools are after the 6-2, 185-pound senior, who demonstrated both the ability to run and pass. He was voted the Northwest Suburban League's Outstanding Back. He accounted for 17 TD's, 10 by passing (school record) and seven rushing. Two is his TD runs were over 70 yards.

"Rick had a super year for us," said Glenn coach Chuck Gordon. "He's a hard worker, very dedicated and had game-breaker potential."

**Tom Redilla, Redford Union, end.** "Our best ballplayer," according to RU coach Harvey Heitman, Redilla was the only Northwest Suburban player to make all-league on both offense and defense.

A two-way starter at both tight end and linebacker, Redilla led the Panthers with 31 catches for 521 yards and seven TD's. Three of his TD catches were game-winners. On defense, the 6-3, 207-pound linebacker led the team in tackles and interceptions (four).

**Steve Tracy, Livonia Churchill, end.** Only 5-8, 155 pounds, Tracy made up for his lack of size with hustle and quickness. He caught 35 passes for 652 yards and four TD's. He averaged 21.6 yards per catch and was named the Chargers' co-MVP this season.

He also intercepted 12 passes in his high school career, kicked off, kicked extra points, and returned punts and kickoffs.

A 3.75 student, Tracy "may be the best small receiver in the state," said coach Ken Kaestner. "Great concentration," added the Churchill coach.

**Mike Skiver, Redford St. Agatha, back.** The 6-1, 191-pound senior is a major college prospect after rushing for 1,147 yards in 144 carries this season.

He scored 14 TD's this season, 32 for his career. His two-year rushing total was 2,752 yards, tops in the area. He is an outstanding student also, carrying a 3.62 GPA.

**Darrell Bartkowiak, Plymouth Salem, back.** "He's the best wishbone full-back we've had since Scott Agnew (1974 All-Stater)," said his coach, Tom Moshimer. "He was our best all-around player."

The 5-11, 213-pound Bartkowiak rushed for 594 yards in 85 carries and scored seven TD's. The senior linebacker and co-captain led a sturdy Salem defense which nearly pulled off the upset of the year against No. 1 ranked Dearborn Fordson.

**John Bielis, Livonia Churchill, back.** The senior co-captain and All-Western Six League pick led the Chargers in rushing with 789 yards in 124 carries. He scored eight TD's and threw for another from the tailback slot.

In his career, Bielis rushed for 1,512 yards and 22 TD's. The 6-0, 185-pound Bielis also played defensive back and led Churchill in tackles and "hitters" points.

"He is a complete player," said coach Ken Kaestner. "John played with a lot of determination and pride." Bielis is also a 3.5 student.

**Ken Newton, Redford Union, lineman.** Ironically, Newton was passed over in the All-Northwest Suburban League selection meeting, but was the top vote-getter among Observer area players on the interior line.

A two-way starter, the 6-4, 220-pound Newton rated second on the team in blocking percentage.

"We ran the ball to Ken's side when we needed yardage," said coach Harvey Heitman.

**Ed Ewald, Catholic Central, lineman.** The 6-0, 190-pound senior "was an excellent two-way starter for us," said coach Tom Mach. "He plays two very physical positions — that of offensive guard and defensive end."

**Marty Piper, Plymouth Salem, lineman.** The 6-3, 215-pound senior was an All-Suburban Eight League choice.

"Marty was our best offensive lineman," said coach Tom Moshimer. "He's a very coachable player — quick off the ball, a good hitter and our most consistent blocker."

Piper, who placed fourth in the Class A state finals last year as a heavy-weight wrestler, made the transition easily this year from tackle to center.

**Phil Jean, Garden City West, lineman.** West coach Dean Shipman described the 6-3, 213-pound Jean as "our best lineman since Kirk Lewis, who later went on to start at Michigan."

Jean, a co-captain, was one of the reasons why West sported a 6-3 record.

He was in on 108 tackles this year and was named All-Tri-River League. He led the way at offensive tackle and defensive linebacker.

"We almost always ran plays behind Phil in short yardage situations," said Shipman. "He also earned the highest grades on our team as a blocker."

**Jeff Cousino, Plymouth Canton, lineman.** One of Canton's tri-captains, the 6-0, 170-pound Cousino was named to the All-Western Six League team as a center. He was voted the team's Best Offensive Lineman, using his one-on-one and combination blocking skills.

The senior is also a hard-hitting left fielder for Canton's outstanding baseball team.

**Mark Blaesser, Plymouth Salem, specialist.** A pleasant surprise this season, the senior kicker was two-for-two on field goals and hit 19 of 21 extra points for a total of 25 points. His kick-offs averaged 48 yards.

**Mike Clayton, Plymouth Canton, punter.** Also a senior, Clayton led the Chiefs with a punting average of 40 yards. The All-Western Six League pick was consistent all season long. His longest punt was 55 yards.

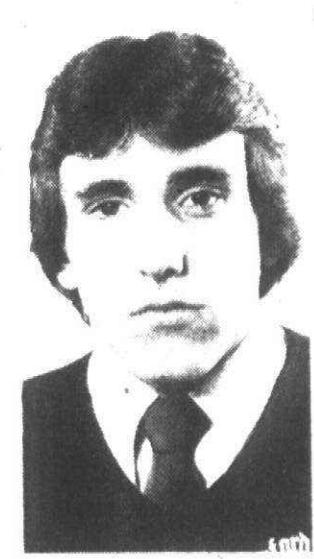

# Salem cagers a power, again

Though Plymouth Salem's boys basketball team finished with a respectable record of 13-9 last season, most of its fans figure it has nowhere to go but up.

After all, the Rocks failed to finish atop the Suburban '8' League for the first time since the basketball program began in 1972, and while 13-9 is a cause for rejoicing in many places, it was nothing special for Salem.

Last year was a rebuilding year, and what was built looks just fine to Salem

coach Fred Thomann.

"We have a good amount of size and experience," said Thomann, who has yet to suffer through a losing season in his nine years at Salem. "We've a good nucleus of veterans and that has to be one of our strengths. Everybody that's back has improved."

"We've playing real good right now as a group," he continued. "The key is going to be how well we play against someone different. I hope we can handle each situation better each day through the season. Hopefully, they'll mature and grow as the season goes along."

**TRI-CAPTAIN MIKE McBRIDE**, Salem's top returnee, is going after his third varsity letter at the guard spot. The 6-foot-3 senior was a third-team All-Observer selection last year and a clutch performer all season long. McBride was also the Rocks' leading scorer.

Joining him in the backcourt is senior tri-captain Dave Miller, an all-purpose player who transferred from Redford Bishop Borgess at the beginning of last season. Miller, 6-foot-3, was a starter most of the year.

Speedy senior Scott Bublin is the other tri-captain, a 6-foot-2 forward

who began playing regularly as a sophomore.

Junior cornermen John Cohen and Dave Houle, both 6-4, will be main cogs in Salem's contingent up front, according to Thomann. Both saw considerable playing time last season.

Senior Norm Haygood is the biggest Rock at 6-foot-7, and he will likely start at center. Haygood, a part-timer last year, is in his third year on the varsity.

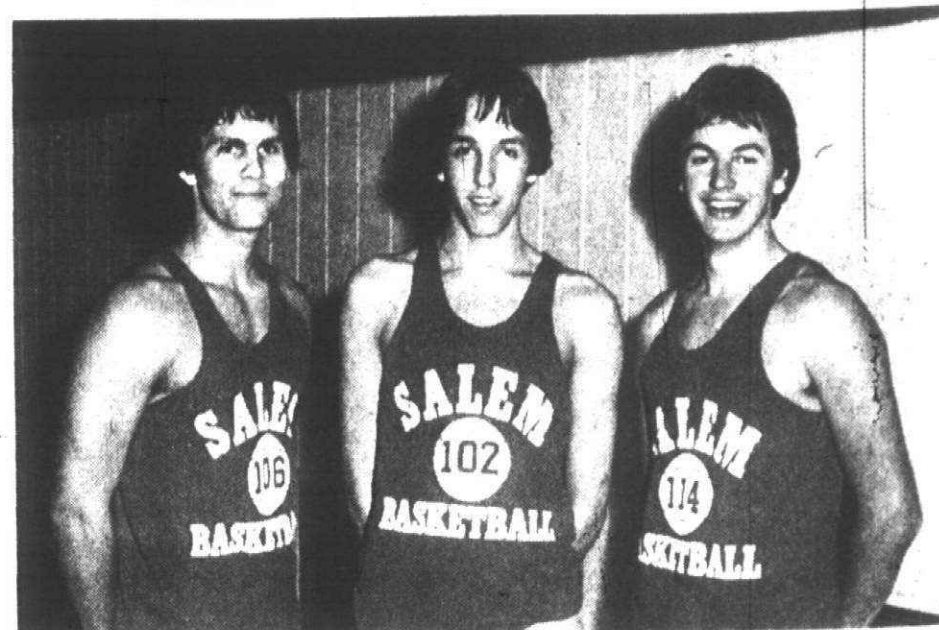
John Kelliher, a 6-1 guard, rounds out Thomann's list of veterans.

**THOMANN SAID** Marvin Zurek, a 6-4 junior, a forward-guard up from the JV, may see a lot of action.

Other newcomers include Glenn Medalle, a 6-1 forward, Matt Broderick, a 5-11 guard, Greg Trim, a 5-8 guard, and Rick Berberet, who at 6-foot-5 is the only sophomore on the varsity roster.

"We have a lot of players who can play," said Thomann. "We have a lot of skill in many of our positions from top to bottom. I feel that a lot of players who might be sitting on the bench could be starters for many other teams."

"Right now, I'm trying to work on what I think our lineups are going to be and I'm trying many different combinations to see which group blends together the best."

**THOMANN, WHO** was Michigan State University's basketball MVP in 1964, said that his team will basically use a man-to-man defense. However, the coach plans to modify his team's offensive strategy depending on the caliber of competition.

"Offensively, we'll be doing whatever the opposing team's defense allows us to do. It all depends on who we're playing against. We'll play inside if they let us go in, but if they take our inside game away, we'll have to go to the perimeter."

Thomann believes almost any team could contend for the Suburban 8 title. "It's going to be one of those years where just about everyone in our league is going to be very competitive," said the Salem coach.

Thomann praised his rugged non-league competition. "We've got a real good schedule. As we go through this season, it's going to be a real challenge for this team to step into the gym and see how we can play against some real good teams."

# Greenfield Village presents 'Victorian Holiday'

The candy cane and holly traditions of Christmas took shape in the 19th century. And advances in manufacturing and mass communications turned a predominantly religious observance into the secular and family holiday celebrated today.

Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village illustrate these origins of the modern Christmas with a "Victorian Holiday" Saturday through Jan. 3.

The modern Christmas season is rich with traditions that have little to do with the Christian observance of Jesus' birth. The year-end, winter holiday that we celebrate is part religious, part Dickens' warmth, a dash of Moore's and Nast's Santa Claus, a variety of ethnic dishes and quite a bit of commercial enterprise. It took its present form in the 19th century.

Greenfield Village's 19th-century buildings are a set for this colorful Christmas. The homes, shops and industries all contribute to the holiday festivities.

At the village print shop visitors see an exhibit of Thomas Nast's famous Christmas pictures. It was Nast, a noted political cartoonist, who created our vision of Santa Claus in numerous holiday pictures for Harper's Weekly. A printer uses a steam operated press to print a guide of the Christmas tour, a 19th century candy ad (available at the Heinz house) and candy labels.

The steam-operated gristmill makes cornmeal for holiday cooking at the Ford home. Cornmeal recipes are discussed and available for visitors.

**THE TRADITIONAL** rural Christmas of the 1870s is the focus of activity at the Ford home. The period is shortly after the 1876 centennial. The cooking activity reflects an interest that developed at that time in early American cooking with cornmeal dumplings and muffins and various kinds of sausage. The decorating themes are patriotic, including a tree festooned with flags. The family activities reflect the Scot-

Irish traditions.

The Wright house, by contrast, is an urban home of the early 20th century. Christmas is becoming standardized. The decorations are from the Ladies' Home Journal. Christmas cards decorate a table. Recorded Christmas music is played on a cylinder recorder. Activities include tree decorating with popcorn strings, strudel making (reflecting the German background of the home) and household chores of the period.

Canadian and English traditions are illustrated at the Edison Homestead, representing grandpa and grandma's house. The period is the 1870s in Canada. Decorations include a kissing ball and Christmas lamps. Activities include grandmother making plum pudding and grandfather whittling a Noah's ark for the grandchildren.

The roots of Christmas traditions are discussed at the Foster house while preparations are made for a party. The period is the 1840s in the Pittsburgh

area. Clement Moore's "A Visit from St. Nicholas" is discussed. The German tree and the English yule log are also exhibited and discussed. Flute and guitar music is performed.

**COOKIES ARE** the center of attraction at the Adams house, an 1870s house with decorations from the period. Making gingerbread and springerle cookies for use as food and decoration is demonstrated. Egg shells are gilted for tree decorating. Other decorations are made of popcorn balls and paper.

In addition to the home activities, the village shows other aspects of the holiday season. At the Heinz house, a commercial confection operation demonstrates the making and packaging of various kinds of confections. At Menlo Park, the year is 1879 and preparations are under way for the first incandescent lighting demonstration on New Year's Eve. The power system is operating, and the early lighting system demonstrated.

Down Christie Street, the Sarah Jordan Boarding House was the first home to be lit with incandescent lamps. The early lighting is in operation. Activities include fancy work and dress making on a sewing machine.

The McGill Shop, formerly a jewelry shop, has been turned into a late 19th century millinery and fancy goods shop. The building was once used as a millinery shop. The front window features lavish holiday dressing. The shop is decorated in authentic style. The building has been renamed Mrs. D. Cohen's Millinery and Fancy Goods Shop.

Christmas as an official holiday came late to many states. The official marking of the holiday started in most states soon after the Civil War but wasn't national until well into the 20th century. This theme is presented at the Scotch Settlement School where a "teacher" discusses the fact that students were required to go to school on Christmas in the 19th century.

Many of our traditional Christmas carols are also a product of the late 19th century. A comic rehearsal of organist and choir demonstrates this theme at the Martha-Mary Chapel.

A holiday feast is being prepared in the colonial kitchen of the Clinton Inn. Foods include roast turkey, sauces and soda bread. Visitors may sample free cider and buy cookies at the Town Hall.

**HENRY FORD** Museum continues the theme of 19th century Christmas with a wide variety of activities throughout the museum. The front hallways are brightly decorated. A large Christmas tree greets visitors at the main entrance to the Hall of Technology.

Three 19th century businesses are open along the row of store front galleries. In the drug store visitors learn about 19th century cold remedies. In the millinery they see a display of fancy headwear. At the blacksmith shop, a wheelwright makes spokes and other wheel parts.

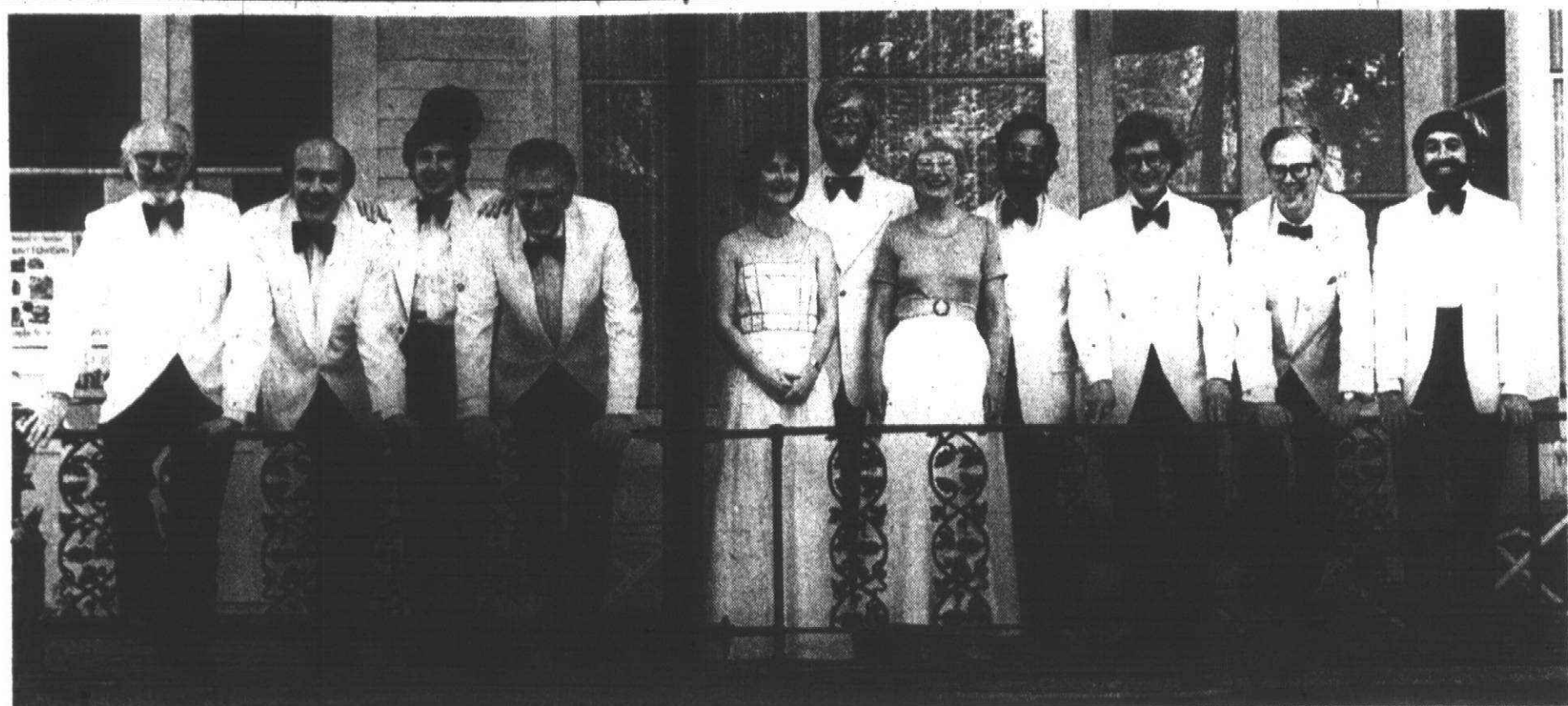

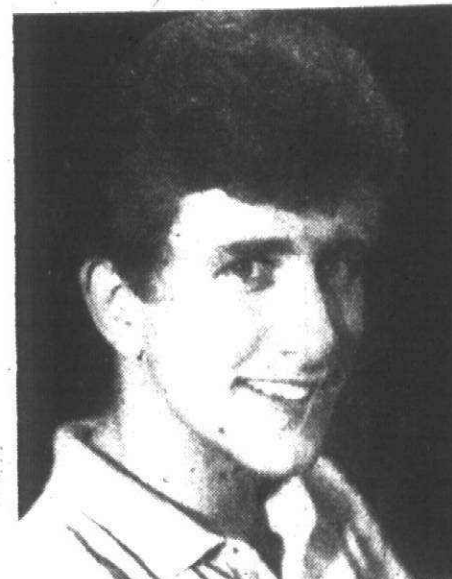
## Livonia man joins graduate repertory

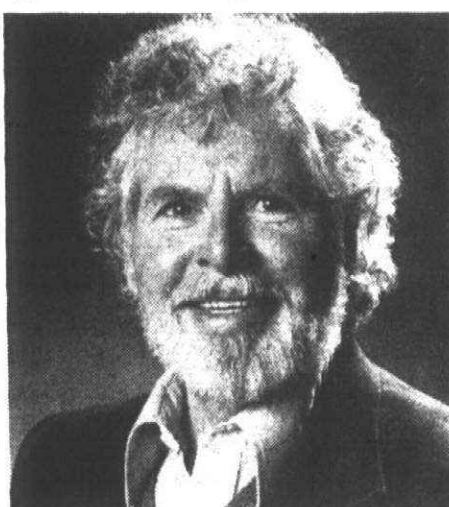

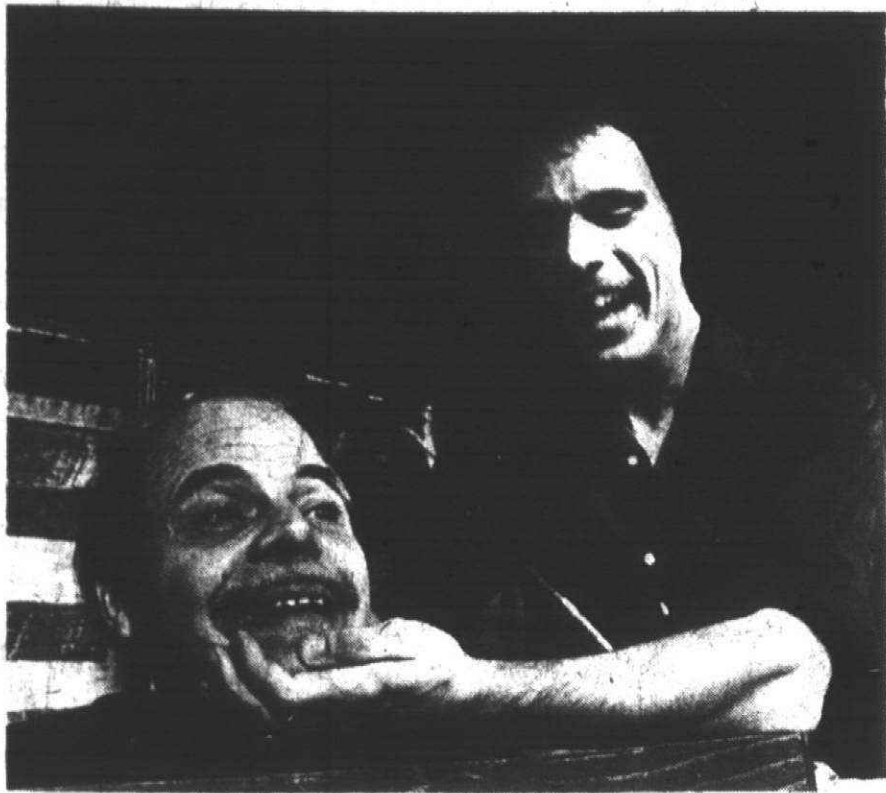

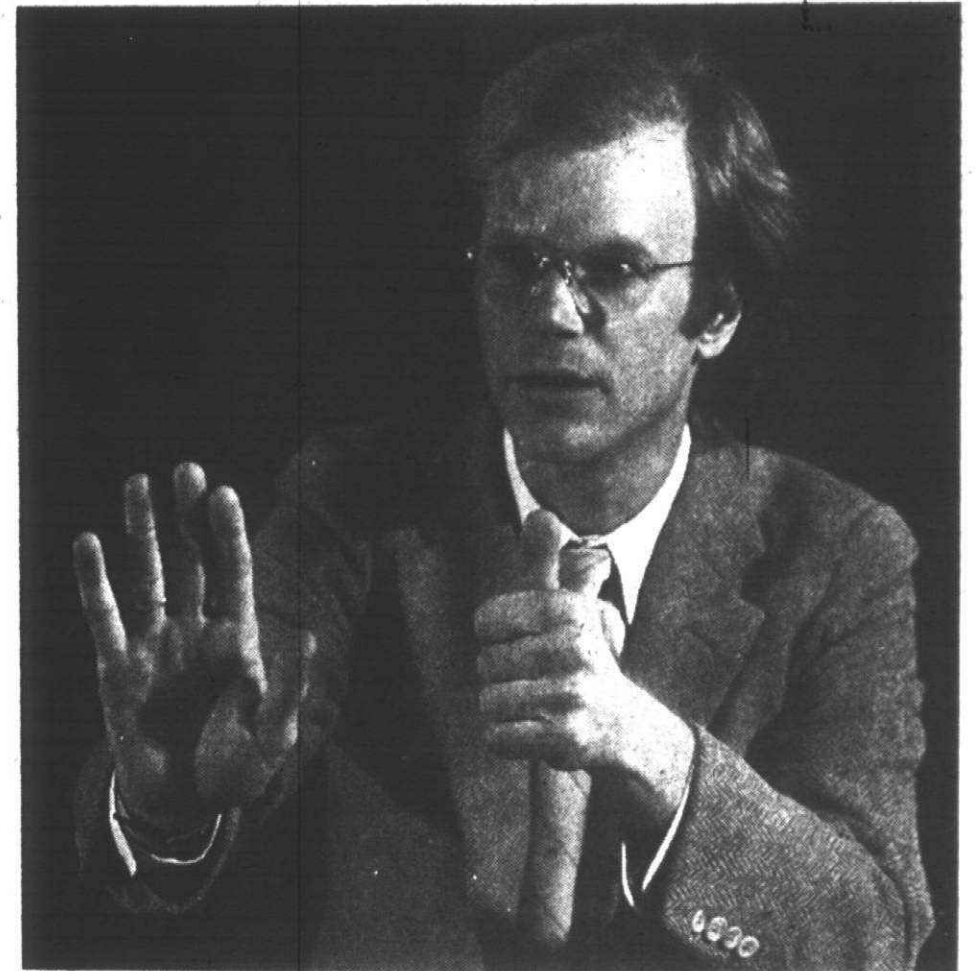

Oh, what a generation did to gangster films. In the '30s, "Scarface," "Little Caesar" and Tom Powers (Cagney in "Enemy") were on top of the world. A Depression-weary public adored them, even though the motion picture academy and pro-censorship leagues abhorred them. Films about anti-establishment thugs who battled, and sometimes beat, the system were as popular as the Eastwood-Bronson revenge pictures of the '70s. Cagney, Robinson and Bogart were catapulted to stardom in such films, and Warner Brothers became the preeminent sound studio by producing these.

In the post-war '40s, however, there was little room for glorified criminals. Cagney in "White Heat" is reduced to a simpering, oedipal psychotic. His Cody Jarrett is a ruthless, friendless, unsympathetic killer. Society didn't drive Cody to a life of crime — his own, demented mind did that.

Tom Power's and Cody Jarrett's crimes are the same, but Tom is allowed a rough upbringing, a war-vet brother who can't make ends meet, a loving mother and a faithful pal. Tom serves time without finking on his pal, and he dies revenging that pal's death. Cody gets headaches; he provides air for a hostage whom he has stuffed in a trunk by shooting the trunk full of holes. Tom dies, while society frolics to the gay strains of "I'm Forever Blowing Bubbles."

An unrepentant Cody goes up with a smirk on his face in a blazing inferno.

The treatment of women changed little in 19 years though. Mae Clarke gets a grapefruit in the face in "Public Enemy."

A recent column condemned one of Mel Brooks' worst films, "High Anxiety," so it's only fair that his best work gets a mention here. Unlike "Anxiety," which takes off in too many directions for its own good, "Frankenstein" sets a steady course and sticks to it.

Writers Brooks and Gene Wilder, Peter Boyle as the monster, Gene Hackman, Madeline Kahn and Marty Feldman, along with Wilder in the title role, provide more laughs than Brooks and company summon in any other film. Keep one thing in mind, though. "Young Frankenstein" parodies James Whales' 1935 "The Bride of Frankenstein," which itself is a parody of Whales' original "Frankenstein" (1931). So Brooks and Wilder, in effect, have merely updated an already funny film. Still, it's the next best thing to either original. Rating: \$2.95.

# 2 wine regions contrast styles

Doing my homework the other night for a column, I reread Frank Prial's piece in Wine Talk on St. Emilion.

His comparisons between this region, so naturally lovely and hospitable, and Medoc, so uninteresting and formal, are fascinating. He compares at great length the atmospheres around the wineries of these two rival regions.

The Medoc is formal dinners, austerity and a generally cultured and refined environment. St. Emilion, on the "other" side of the Gironde, is farm country.

There the dinners are in the kitchen, the wine in inelegant cups or glasses, and the winemakers simple folk. These are farm people; the Medocs winemakers are city-based. St. Emilion wines are softer, more approachable, less austere than the hard Medocs, like the people.

IT OCCURRED to me that this is the exact distinction I have felt for years working back and forth between Napa and Sonoma counties, especially the larger Russian River area to the north in the latter.

Compared to Sonoma, Napa is intensively developed, platted and civilized.

The wineries are clean, the tasting rooms commercial for the many tourists that go through each day, and one rather gets a feeling of standardization and regimen.

There is a cloistered feeling at Mondavio Inglenook and Christian Brothers reflect the feeling of big business (and they are). There is a specific order to the events at Beringer, and at Hans Kornell you get a speech and one glass of champagne. That's it.

Sterling is antiseptic. Beaulieu very smooth and orderly. There are many exceptions, of course, but in general the major wine producers of Napa have developed a set of mechanisms to formalize the procedure of wine tasting.

Even Charlie Wagner of Caymus has put in a tasting room. In Napa, many do not even post "No Smoking" signs. One knows that is something that is not done.

BUT IN THE Russian River area above Santa Rosa, it is all different. There you sit in Amerigo Raffanelli's kitchen and sip Zinfandel, drink Chardonnay around the pool at Stemmer, stand in a barn at Mill Creek, Pedron-

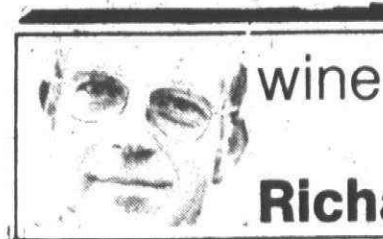

celli and Preston.

Organized tours do not exist, but they will "show you around" if you like, all the while enjoying a glass filled time and again from the wooden casks. Some have tasting rooms, but here the winery dogs go in and out of them along with the guests. Winery dogs (a special kind of breed) simply do not mix with the public in Napa.

Napa itself was a more informal place before the tourists began to overrun it a decade ago. And the area around Sonoma City to the south, in-

cluding Kenwood and Chateau St. Jean, is moving that way, alas.

In time, the Russian River will need to standardize to cope with the tourists who spill out of Napa. But not yet.

Then the way to find the farmers and winegrowers of St. Emilion here will force us to go to Ukiah, Gold Country and San Luis Obispo. In these regions, the warmth and friendship of the old days still exist, even among the newer wineries.

See the Russian River before it's too late.

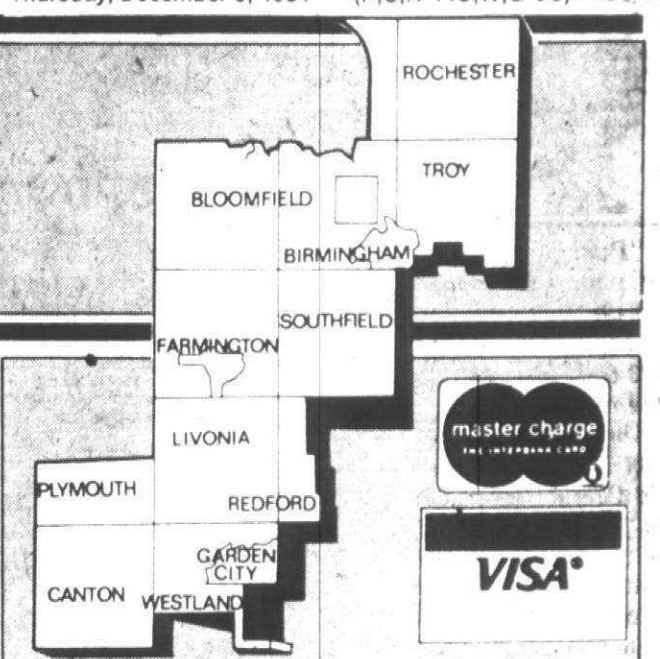
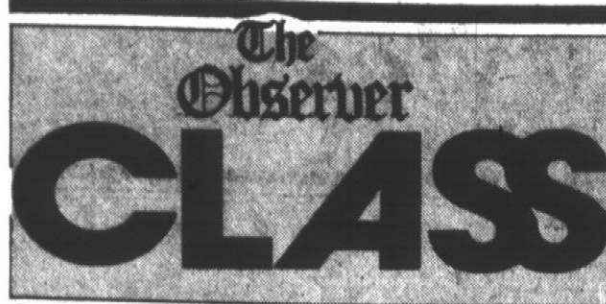

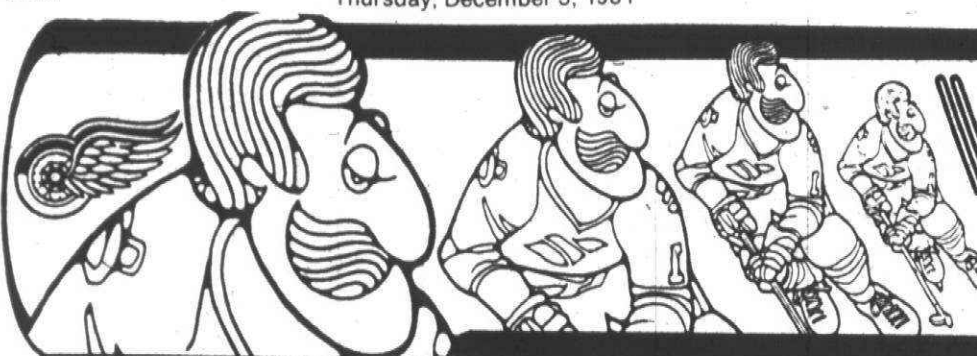
