Officials brace for flood of tax appeals

Unhappy about your property taxes? Local officials are expecting business to be brisk when review boards begin hearings in March. Last year the state mandated changes in the way property taxes are computed. As a result, many residents face steep hikes on household property taxes. Residents may appeal assessments of their property by appearing before the municipality's board of review.

"We expect a tremendous volume (of appeals) this year," said Maria Falkiewicz, treasurer for Canton Township. Property taxes in Canton are rising an average 16.5 percent. Canton residents will be required to make advance appointments for the board of review, and "people should start now," added Mrs. Falkiewicz.

Plymouth Township Treasurer Joe West agrees that more appeals are likely this year. Plymouth Township residents face a 25-percent hike in taxes.

The city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township aren't requiring residents to make appointments for their appeals

before the board of review.

"It's first come, first served," said West.

PERSONS PLANNING appeals should note these times and procedures:

• Plymouth Township residents must obtain a petition from Township Hall for appearance before the board. Hours for the board of review are from 9 a.m. to noon and 2-5 p.m. Tuesday, March 2 and Wednesday, March 10; and 2-9 p.m. (closed 5-6 p.m.) Monday, March 8.

• Plymouth Township commercial, industrial and apart-

ment property-owners' hearings take place from 9 a.m. to noon and 2-5 p.m. Monday and Tuesday, March 15-16.

• City of Plymouth requires no prior appointments or forms. The board meets from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesday, March 2; and 3-9 p.m. Wednesday, March 3.

• Canton residents must obtain a form from Township Hall. The form must be returned prior to scheduling an appointment with the board of review. The board will begin holding meetings on Tuesday, March 2.

Offer aid to residents Realtors fight appraisals

Real estate companies in the Plymouth-Canton area are banding together to help residents fight skyrocketing property-tax assessments.

The real estate salesmen will provide information for residents who appeal their assessments to local boards of review, which will begin hearings in early March.

"I have a feeling the regular homeowner doesn't know how to fight his property-tax assessment," said Ken Dividock, a broker for Century 21 Hartford 429 Inc., in Canton.

"We will help (people), and then they will have the ammunition to go in front of these appeal boards," added Dividock.

THE REALTORS will help people determine the current market value of the homes.

Houses are supposed to be assessed at half the market value, based on a 2½-year sales survey. A factor is multiplied against the assessment to obtain a state equalized valuation (SEV).

The SEV is multiplied by the tax rate, given in mills, to obtain the homeowner's property-tax amount. One mill equals \$1,000 assessed property valuation.

Last January, the state ordered that SEVs be figured individually — by class — and not lumped with business and industrial classifications. As a result, home property taxes are rising.

Residents in Canton are seeing a property-tax increase of about 16.5 percent. Taxes jumped 25 percent in Plymouth Township.

HOMES SIMPLY aren't selling well because of high interest rates, unemployment and a poor economy.

Dividock believes assessments now are too high and should be based on the current market value of a house. He points out that homes aren't selling at the high prices that were prevalent in 1978 and 1979.

Some participating realty firms will provide photostat copies of sales data, for a fee, to aid in the fight.

"I was just trying to think of some way to help the public," Dividock said. "We're willing to help the public, and, of course, it's good for us because people may remember us when they want to buy or sell their house."

Dividock thinks a large number of persons going to the boards of review will give a clear message to officials.

"I just think if you get these lines long enough to the appeal boards, they'll get the idea," said Dividock.

"Hey, we're (Canton Township) dying out here," he added.

Board mulls cutting year-round school schedule

A series of meetings will be held next week as a prelude to making a decision on reducing the number of elementary schools on the year-round Extended School Year (ESY) schedule.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education now is considering whether to take one or more schools off the ESY schedule.

After it makes that decision, the board will determine which specific buildings will be returned to the nine-month Traditional School Year (TSY).

Before that decision is made, administrators and board members will be meeting with parents living in ESY school attendance areas.

The first meeting was held Tuesday night of this week at Isbister Elementary in Plymouth Township.

Other meetings scheduled, all to begin at 7 p.m., are: Hulsing Elementary, Feb. 2; Miller Elementary, Feb. 3; and Gallimore Elementary, Feb. 4.

EARLIER the thinking of the board was that Isbister and Gallimore would be the first ESY schools to be returned to a TSY schedule if needed because they had the smaller enrollments of the year-round schools.

If the board decides to eliminate ESY at more than two schools, however, Miller and Hulsing likely would be the candidates and so meetings have been scheduled with parents of those schools.

To date meetings have not been slated for parents in the attendance areas of Erickson and Field elementaries in southern Canton — ESY schools with the largest enrollments.

The push to reduce the number of elementaries is twofold — declining enrollment and financial.

When the school district first began to experience declin-

ing enrollment last year one of the steps taken was to switch Pioneer Middle from an ESY to a TSY schedule.

Although ESY allows a building to hold one-third more students than the nine-month schedule, it also is more expensive to operate a year-round building.

Monday night Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business, told the board the administration was working up the cost savings which would be realized by an ESY reduction plan.

THE SAVINGS would be in fewer teachers and administrators as well as lowered maintenance, busing and utility costs.

For the coming school year the school board presently is looking at a budget deficit which could reach \$3 million and soon will begin coming up with a list of cuts which will be made to balance the '82-83 operating budget.

The school board will be meeting in workshop budget ses-

sions Friday night, Feb. 12, and all day Saturday, Feb. 13, to prioritize cuts.

Because the meetings with parents will be completed by that weekend, most trustees feel they will be close to making a decision on ESY reductions by that time.

The board also will be discussing whether to seek additional millage in the June 14 annual election.

Monday night Superintendent Dr. John M. Hoben told the board that the district now is levying 1.9 fewer operating mills and 2.3 fewer debt-retirement mills than it did six years ago.

Hoben cautioned the board Monday that it appears quite likely that during the next fiscal year Plymouth-Canton will reach the point where it will not receive any general state aid because of an increasing local tax base.

A real challenge for the new fiscal year, added Hoben, is that the board must negotiate labor contracts with seven unions in the district.

Teachers organize group to lobby for greater clout

Teachers at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) want their views heard — and they are doing something to achieve that goal.

Approximately 35 teachers at Plymouth Canton High School have formed the "Plymouth Canton Teacher's Guild" — a group that wants a voice in its working environment.

"One goal is to try to improve the relationship of all the factions (teachers, administrators and the school board)," says Dave Seemann, a spokesman of the group. "Teachers want to be included in issues and be involved in decisions before they go down the pike."

Seemann, who spent eight years in industry before founding professions, says teachers are "viewed at the bottom of the rung" and aren't properly consulted on changes or decisions at the CEP.

He stresses the group is not designed to supplement the Plymouth-Canton Education Association (PCEA), the teacher's union, nor is it intended to function as an adjunct to CEP administration.

THE GUILD, which formed last week, will meet with both Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton teachers for the first time in mid-February.

Seemann says forming the guild came from informal talks in the teacher's lounge last fall. The chief topic of discussion at that time was "burnout," according to Seemann.

"We know teachers that are burned out, that are depressed. They are guilty, angry, helpless," Seemann says.

"The park is as big as a school district in itself. The anonymity of the teacher has contributed to a lot of bad ideas being perpetuated. There should be some climate of interest, some exciting feeling at the workplace."

There are 98 teaching positions at Canton and 89 at Salem. Each building has one principal and four area coordinators, who serve as immediate supervisors to teachers. Approximately 4,000 students attend classes at the CEP.

KENT BUIKEMA, Canton's principal, says he was aware that teachers were meeting, but didn't know a group was formalized. He feels teachers are "overlooking some of the opportunities and avenues they could use" to give input into decisions.

Buikema says the faculty-senate, which has teacher representation has been "quite successful in resolving problems and concerns" of teachers at the park. He adds teachers may work through their respective area coordinators in voicing concerns.

Seemann, an English teacher at Canton, says the faculty-senate is "administratively designed." He feels that group only is an advisory committee — not a voice of the teachers.

Seemann adds that teacher concerns are not properly recognized by area coordinators.

A gasp of fresh air

Nursery may get new life

Plymouth Nursery got a gasp of fresh air Monday.

In fact the second wind might be enough to keep the nursery school running for another two decades.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education took action Monday night which could result in the preschool facility continuing to operate at its Warren and Haggerty site in Canton.

The nursery, in operation now for some 20 years, will now appear before the Canton Township Planning Commission for the second step towards a final solution.

Last fall the Wayne County Department of Health threatened to close down the nursery because of a septic failure at the site. The nursery occupies the former Hough

School owned by Plymouth-Canton Community Schools and leased to Plymouth Nursery for a nominal fee (i.e. \$1 a year).

In return for the nominal rent, the nursery has agreed to handle building and site maintenance.

The only solution to the septic failure, however, is to hook-up to a sanitary sewer line in the area which would cost more than what the nursery has in its treasury.

Last fall the nursery board appealed to school trustees for help but the board said it was unable to offer financial aid because of its stringent operating budget.

Because the Hough School site is 9.9 acres, the tap-in fee to tie into the sanitary sewer would be more than \$7,000.

The nursery, however, only uses two

acres for its school, parking lot and playground. Someone discovered that if the lot were split into two parcels (7.9 and 2 acres) the tap-in fee charged the nursery would only be \$2,675.

Jan Ryan, secretary of the nursery board, told school trustees that the nursery had the \$2,675 in its treasury and would spend it for a tap-in because the parents wanted to remain at the Hough site instead of seeking another location.

Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business, said if the district decides at a later date to sell the Hough School site it would simply pay a \$50 fee to Canton Township and request that the lot be combined back to 9.9 acres.

Two men arrested for house break-in

Two 18-year-old Westland men face charges stemming from a Canton home break-in three weeks ago.

David Jones of Cascade and Anthony Sprankle of Caledonia, both Westland, were arraigned Tuesday in 35th District Court on breaking-and-entering charges.

They stood mute before Judge Dunbar Davis, who entered innocent pleas in their behalf. Both men posted were released on \$2,000 bond.

Preliminary examination in the district court is scheduled for Feb. 4. Police also have a warrant for the arrest of Lawrence Beseau, 19, of Deerfield in Westland, whom they believe has gone to Louisiana.

CANTON POLICE Lt. Dennis Joker said thieves broke a window and entered a house on Warren

Road west of Beck Jan. 6. About \$1,100 worth of assorted household goods and jewelry were stolen.

A 1981 Oldsmobile parked in the garage also was stolen, according to the report.

JOKER said troopers at the Michigan State Police post in Ypsilanti stopped the occupants Jan. 25 on a traffic violation. He credited the troopers with tracking down leads and recovering much of the goods.

"Through that (traffic) arrest, troopers were able to find out where the car came from," said Joker. "The majority of the property has been recovered."

Breaking-and-entering a house is a felony punishable by 15 years in prison upon conviction.




Dynamic Aerobics is more than just exercise. It's a fitness routine — and dancing — set to music.

"It's more of a routine," explains Dates. "It's not just going in and doing situps and pushups."


The two-year-old program is full during the winter months, but registration for spring sessions takes place in the next couple of months.

Bus routes shrink Seniors fight SEMTA cuts

It became clear last week that senior citizens will put the heat on SEMTA to maintain bus services. But will they campaign for a yes vote for a tax increase to pay for them?

That question faces officials of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority as they puzzle out how to cut services and/or raise new revenue.

"I've been at SEMTA five years and have been part of expanding service. I don't enjoy cutting," Dan Dirks, coordinator of community relations, said at a public hearing last week in Dearborn.

The audience was dominated by senior citizens with a scattering of the handicapped and a couple of college students.

"We have raised fares approximately once a year. The most the market will bear is once a year and the amount of inflation," Dirks said when asked why fares couldn't be hiked instead of services cut or taxes raised.

SEMTA'S PLANS are indefinite, but the seven-county transit agency has known for a long time it would need a new infusion of revenue beginning this year.

Reason No. 1, according to Acting General Manager Gary Krause's charts, is that federal Urban Mass Transit Administration grants will be phased out. UMTA gave SEMTA \$41 million in fiscal last year, intends to give \$31 million this year, and is expected to grant \$19 million in '83, \$6 million in '84 and nothing after that.

Reason No. 2, said Krause, is that \$16 million of tri-county license fee revenue has been tied up in an escrow account because of a lawsuit filed by the Oakland County Road Commission. OCRC has fought SEMTA funding and transit planning politically for years.

SO THE TRANSIT authority has taken two steps to cut back.

Early in January, it cut \$2.3 million in downtown office operations, said Krause. These included "freezing staff positions, reducing funds for advertising, consultants, travel, meetings, supplies, equipment; also included was postponement of small bus expansion scheduled for January through June

and the cancellation of an extra train that served Birmingham and Royal Oak in the early afternoons." Dirks said central office staffers are working an additional half-hour a day without compensation.

On Feb. 16 the SEMTA board will consider \$3.7 million cuts. Nine routes will be dropped, virtually every other route will receive less service, and some routes will lose weekend service. The cuts would take effect in March.

Last week's public hearing in Dearborn was about those cuts.

SUE AND George Illingworth, Redford Township residents and members of the Michigan Assn. of the Blind, were unhappy at learning they might lose weekend service to a medical office at 12 Mile-Evergreen. "That's what we were afraid of," Mrs. Illingworth said.

John Bosch, president of the blind association, said, "We handicapped people can't drive. We are prevented from driving."

A Greenfield Village official, Robert Dawson, said, "200,000 convention people per year come by bus to Greenfield Village (via Route 200). It's inconvenient for them to rent cars and come out. We would lose 175,000 of them if weekend service were dropped. The average visitor spends \$9.50 at Greenfield Village."

A host of Dearborn senior citizens and Doane Jackson from the city administration protested cutting of service in the southeastern part of town. "That area has the highest unemployment, the lowest per capita income, the highest average age and the newest subsidized housing," said Jackson.

They peppered Dirks and Bob Campbell, scheduling manager, with a host of suggestions and alternatives.

DIRKS REPLIED to some of the questions:

- On using smaller buses: The same bus is frequently used on different routes. In the morning rush hour, it may be crowded; in mid-day runs, mostly empty. It isn't feasible, however, to pay the driver to return to the depot, pick up a smaller bus (which would have to be purchased) and drive out again. "Some 80 to 90 percent of the cost is labor, not the vehicle," he added.

- On advertising local routes more: "We've put notices in local papers and churches. Print and radio advertising are expensive. With 50 routes, you can't advertise much."

- On placing more SEMTA signs in shopping malls: "Many mall owners don't want any." He didn't name those malls.

- On eliminating a bus drivers road-e-o at the Pontiac Silverdome: "We do this on our own time. The only expense is getting the bus from the Troy garage to the Silverdome, which isn't far away. It's a very good morale booster and makes drivers aware of the need to be good."

- On encouraging Henry Ford Community College and University of Michigan-Dearborn students to take SEMTA buses: "He have sent Henry Ford schedules for distribution at registration time. In many of the ideas you have suggested, we are dependent on the assistance of other people. Sometimes we (SEMTA) are a low priority for them."

- On subsidizing taxis for the elderly and handicapped: Farmington, Livonia and Plymouth have had them for two years. They can complement the small bus service but not replace it.

- On cutting other costs: "There's a hiring freeze. Twenty percent of the downtown jobs are unfilled. We got no across-the-board raise last year. We are all working 2½ hours a week more without being paid for it."

HERE ARE some of the cuts proposed for western Wayne County by route number:

185 Westland-Dearborn-Ecorse — Reduce total hours of service on weekday and Saturday.

200 Michigan Ave. — Eliminate some weekday trips and eliminate Sunday service to Greenfield Village; reduce Saturday service.

240 Westland-Detroit — Reduce round trips.



Dr. Rosenthal says, "It is generally agreed that the U.S. offers the best quality health care in the world today."

However the only proof she offers of this "best quality health care" is that we spend the highest percentage of our gross national product (GNP) on health. She admits we don't have the best health statistics.

Is that why American cars are the best in the world? American cars used to be bigger, waste more gasoline, and have little room left inside for the riders.

Because we Americans have a higher infant mortality rate and a shorter life expectancy, I reach the conclusion that the American health care system is concerned with making money more than it is with improving our health care.

The scientific approach is to observe the facts and then decide. The facts are as follows: (1) Infant mortality rates and life expectancy rates in the U.S. are worse than in countries with national health insurance. Plans continue to open community college

A date of June 1 has been set for Superintendent Timothy Dyer to make a final recommendation on whether the Wayne/Westland Community Schools should establish its own community college.

The Board of Education Monday approved a resolution 6-0, with President Donald Rusnock absent, authorizing school administrators to study thoroughly the local community college concept proposed by Dyer.

The resolution directs the administration to:

- Survey residents' attitude, interest and depth of support for establishing a new community college in the district.

trict.

- Survey students at the two high schools in the district — John Glenn and Wayne Memorial — to determine their willingness to attend a Wayne/Westland Community College.

- Appoint an advisory committee of residents and leaders of business, industry and labor to study the feasibility of the proposal.

- Conduct public hearings throughout the district to allow for public reaction and comment. The district includes a portion of Canton Township.

- Prepare the paper work to petition the state board of education for Wayne/Westland to be designated a K-

Wayne-Westland schools

The district serves southeast Canton.

14 school district.

ONLY TWO board members commented on the resolution prior to its adoption.

"The action we're taking tonight is just one more step into deciding whether we're going to or not (establish a community college)," said Fred

Warmbier. "This does not commit any board members into deciding whether they're for it or not."

"No question, the need is there," said David Moranty. "My only concern is that it doesn't affect K-12 or increase tax problems for the public."

The public hearings will be held at junior high schools in the district.

They are scheduled Feb. 16 at Marshall, 35100 Bayview; March 9 at Stevenson, 38501 Palmer; March 10 at Adams, 33475 Palmer; and March 11 at Franklin, 33555 Annapolis.

All meetings will begin at 7 p.m.

Dyer said he expects to announce the members of the advisory committee at the board's meeting Feb. 1.

Dyer said the community survey likely will include both written questionnaires and telephone inquiries. He said about 2,000 people have been contacted in past surveys.

DYER ALSO said tentative plans

call for surveying all seniors and juniors in both district high schools for their willingness to attend a community college within the district.

Even if all indications are positive and state approval is granted, Dyer said it would be the fall of 1983 before a two-year Wayne/Westland Community College could open.

Dyer has said that the need for vocational re-training opportunities rather than economic conditions should be the major focus in making a decision on an in-district community college.

HIT AND SPLIT

In the example, white needs to play a 4-2. What is your suggested move?

The obvious move would be to hit black on the 2 point with a checker from the 4 and 6 points. Another option which looks interesting (but may be dangerous) would be hitting black on the 9 point with a 12 point checker and slot-hitting black on the 2 point with a 4

point checker.

However, with this move, white cannot protect the 2 point blot. Thus, if black were to hit, white would find himself in grave danger if he doesn't come off the bar immediately.

Another option which plays well and is more effective would be to hit black on the 9 point with the 4 roll and split the back runners on the black 1 point to the 3 point. This move accomplishes

much. With black on the bar, he may not re-enter for at least one roll. In the event black is unable to safety his 8 point checker immediately, white may succeed in hitting this one also.


White's open blot on the 9 point may be used on the next roll to close the 5 point or the 7 point to form a prime. Also, having split the 1 point checkers, white may be able to roll another two and capture black's 3 point; he will eventually be able to run much easier from the 3 point instead of the 1 point.

The hit-and-split play can be extremely effective, but there is one final thing that players should notice with this move. By hitting the 9 point blot and splitting to the 3 point, black is unable to close the 3 point on his next roll because he will be spending a half-roll to re-enter from the bar. If black wants to hit white on the next roll, he will be forced to slot-hit white on the 1 or 3 point or hope for a long shot to hit the 9 point blot.

Before this move, I would have pegged black as the favorite to win, but now the tables may easily turn.

A final word: In the event black doesn't re-enter, white may easily redouble the cube and force black out of the game. Black would be hard-pressed to accept the double because of his two outer board blots.

Arcade brings excitement, but location is hazardous

AFTER SEVERAL MEETINGS — one in a closed session — and a battle in court, Canton Township will have its first arcade.

The arcade issue is a long, difficult question which is far from being settled. The initial action from Canton's Board of Trustees came three weeks ago with conditional approval of an arcade at the southeast corner of Ford and Lilley, in the building vacated by The Nice Slice Delicatessen.

Approval came after hours of discussion. It passed by a 4-3 margin — hardly overwhelming support for a difficult issue.

We have no objections to arcades. In fact, properly managed arcades are a welcomed addition to the Plymouth-Canton community. We see problems, however, with the Ford-Lilley intersection — the site of the proposed facility.

The Ford-Lilley corner is dangerous — no question about it. No sidewalks exist, and lighting is poor. This is hardly a corner conducive for safety of children.

THE ARCADE ISSUE is a classical question of allowing private enterprise to capitalize at the expense of public safety.

In fairness to Canton's board and the arcade operators, there seems to be an honest attempt — and awareness — to eliminate the safety problems at this corner.

But it's a shame the safety problem wasn't properly addressed before the decision reached the board level.

The arcade operators, Jamil Akhtar of Plymouth Township and Barbara Baldwin of Livonia, gained approval from the Canton Planning Commission to open an arcade at this site.

That was a major mistake.

After this approval, the operators "signed their lives away" to finance not only an arcade, but an adjacent restaurant — similar to Chuck E. Cheese's, a highly successful operation in Westland and other cities in the Detroit area.

AFTER FULFILLING ordinance requirements, Akhtar and Baldwin, who both work in the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, were irate when they met a snag from the board.

Finally, the board addressed the safety problem, but it was too late.

It's awfully hard to keep private business out of your community after it gains planning commission approval and follows ordinance regulations.

The operators felt backed into a corner, with their investment in jeopardy. Subsequently, they filed suit against the board, backing the officials into the other corner.

A decision had to be made.

With reluctance, the board gave Akhtar and Baldwin conditional approval to open the arcade. Some of the conditions include no more than 25 machines, installation of bike racks, improved lighting and other safety precautions.

THE BOARD, WISELY, attached enough conditions on the arcade to help maintain some level of safety.

We hope the management of the arcade will reflect the same concern for safety.

Likewise, Plymouth-Canton parents should be aware that the Ford-Lilley corner is not the safest spot for an arcade. They must instruct their children accordingly.

When the restaurant-arcade opens, we hope Plymouth-Canton residents will enjoy it.

But beware of the dangers linked to that site. The consequences could be serious.



'A great(?) location'

What if industry had listened to George?

Years ago, one of the favorite expressions was "Let George do it."

Anytime there was a problem of any kind, it was passed off with "Let George do it."

The Stroller got to thinking about this the other night while listening to reports of the union officials and the auto makers, and he got to wondering if the present sickness of the auto industry could have been avoided if we had let George do it.

In this case, it was George Romney, a very intelligent, sharp-chinned individual, who took over the presidency of American Motors Corp. and set out on a campaign to make America small-car conscious.

His slogan was "Get rid of the gas-guzzling dinosaurs," arguing it would be more profitable to drive a small car that used less fuel.

He put on a grand campaign. One of his cars was the Rambler. It was a rather neat-looking job, even though it lacked the frills of the larger cars.

GEORGE'S CAMPAIGN bumped into one big

obstacle: General Motors. It was a one-sided battle. The word was passed along that Romney was attempting to break GM — and that put a crimp in his campaign.

Along about the same time, the Kaiser-Frazer Co. started to build small cars and Jeeps at Willow Run, but it, too, failed to put a dent in the big-car market.

One of those who turned his back on Romney's plan was The Stroller, and now he has to smile about the morning he made the decision.

At breakfast one Saturday morning, wife Leona remarked that there was a big ad in the paper for small cars, and she suggested maybe we should try one.

At the time, she was in the market for a car. So off to the dealer's showroom we went. Parked right in the middle was one of these small cars. We were given a fine welcome.

"TAKE IT OUT and drive it a bit," the salesman said. This was unusual. But we took it out, and Leo-

na did the driving.

From the moment she stepped on the gas pedal, it was seen that she was not well pleased. This was especially true when she had seen a nice, big, red car in the showroom. When she saw it, she said, "I always liked a red car."

As we drove the little car around the block, she started to find fault with it. It rattled. It steered rather stiffly. It didn't ride very well. And so on and so on.

Finally, we got back to the showroom. There stood the big red car. While she talked with one

salesman, The Stroller made a deal with another.

When she walked away from the small car, The Stroller pointed to the big red car and said, "Go ahead. Drive it. That's your new car."

She was thrilled no end. And The Stroller felt pleased, too, not only because his wife was satisfied but because the big car looked like much the better buy.

SO WE TURNED our backs on George Romney. And we were not alone.

When George saw what was happening, he turned to politics. He organized Citizens for Michigan, went to the Constitutional Convention and defeated Gov. John Swainson. Then he got Potomac fever, resigned as governor to take a cabinet post and turned the statehouse over to William Milliken.

And as The Stroller listened to the wrangling the other night, he couldn't help wondering if the sickness of the auto industry could have been averted more than 20 years ago if we had "Let George do it."

Gypsy moth spreads wings

Carefully, gingerly, Carl Pursell is expanding the Gypsy Moths organization from the U.S. House of Representatives to the Senate, state capitals and even city halls.

Pursell, the 2nd District congressman from Plymouth, must be careful in order not to alienate the westerners in the White House and the Republican leadership.

And he must move gingerly because after 1982, the Northeastern and Midwestern states will lose 16 representatives. Whatever they do must not seem threatening to other regions with which they must swap votes.

The third-term Republican moderate has had face-to-face meetings with Ronald Reagan and such White House staffers as Edwin Meese III and James Baker III. The message, put more bluntly than Pursell would, is: "Let's move on, Mr. President — the West has been won."

"WE'VE FORMED an economic advisory council to put together our priorities," Pursell said here recently. "They (the White House) gave me the go-ahead. It'll all be done from a Republican point of view."

It is a typical Pursell move. Your ordinary lawmaker thinks of his level of government — be it local, state or national — and of his committee.

Not Pursell. He looks at a problem, then draws together people from all levels of government, from administrative and legislative branches, and from the private sector, when appropriate.

"You need to get the jurisdictional levels to interface," he said, tossing around a little Washingtonese.

He has had a meeting with Gov. Jim Thompson of Illinois. He has drawn the interest of Gov. Thomas Kean of New Jersey. He will receive advice from Minnesota Gov. Albert Quie, a former congressional colleague. Mayors and state legislators are being lined up.

"We looked for constructive, long-range thinkers. We're not out to build a superstar like John Anderson. They must have the ability to become masters of policy areas," said Pursell.

WHY DOES a populous Midwest state like Michigan get back 65 cents for every \$1 it sends to Washington while little New Mexico gets \$1.90 — and severance tax money besides?

"The sunbelt has set its priorities," answered Pursell. "First, water. Second, defense. Third, oil legislation. All produce jobs. That's the 'southern strategy.' They build up seniority and learn where all the levers of power are."

"The Northeast-Midwest has many priorities. New England is energy-short. New York is after transit money and aid to cities. The Midwest is industry-oriented. Iowa is agricultural. We really don't have a set of priorities. We divide and go our own ways."

And so the Republican federal-state-local economic advisory council, the outgrowth of the Gypsy Moths, will attempt to set priorities and use friendly persuasion on its fellow American regions to stop the economic bloodletting.

PURSELL, BY some tabulations, can be made to look liberal. It upsets conservatives in his district.

But the tabulation done by Roll Call Report, to which this newspaper subscribes, shows him backing Reagan on key budget and tax measures six times out of nine. He's tied with William Broomfield of the 19th District and ahead of Guy VanderJagt of the 9th District — who wanted to be vice president or maybe House GOP leader.


A pro-Reagan voting record on the big ones, Pursell believes, puts him in a better position to bargain with the cowboys and counterbalance the weight of the southern "Boll Weevils."

Lens flare can add flair, but exposure is tricky



Lens flare is light reflecting off the many outer and inner surfaces of the camera lens.

Most photographers avoid it. Flare produces a glaring spread of light that probably has ruined countless photographs.

But when carefully used and monitored through the viewfinder of your camera, flare can produce spectacular and exciting results and give your pictures an artistic flavor. Handled properly, lens flare can display dramatically the blinding presence of the sun in your pictures while at the same time tone down a cluttered background.

Flare can give your photo a romantic feeling and enhance an otherwise dull scene. With the sun just outside the scene, often times a misty, diffused look will be obtained in the final picture.

ALTHOUGH LENS manufacturers go to great lengths to prevent flare by using special coatings on their lenses, flare is still easy to obtain.

Usually, just having the sun or other bright light source in or just outside a scene is likely to produce flare. This is because light rays are picked up and reflected by the front glass elements of the lens.

Remember, a lens shade ordinarily is used to prevent flare, so it is important to leave it off the camera when you desire flare in your shot.

Determining exposure can be tricky.

Your camera's meter will translate the presence of bright light into an exposure that will produce a darker than normal print. But this is fine if your desire is to silhouette the main subject.

In fact, try neglecting your meter altogether by setting the aperture at f-16 and using the fastest shutter speed. All solid objects in the scene will come out jet black, and the sun will appear like a sparkling star.

IF YOU WANT to produce a more-normal-looking image, determine exposure by pointing your camera away from the source of flare.

Then manually set the exposure according to that reading, disregarding the meter when the flare reappears in

the viewfinder. With automatic exposure cameras, you'll have to use the manual override.

Remember, for your eye's safety, never look directly at the sun through the viewfinder. With a little practice, you'll find it easy to place the sun where you desire in your composition without having to look straight at it.

Correctly used, flare can add excitement and interest to your picture. So don't always think of it as something to avoid in your photography. Learn to improve your photographic style with "flair."

Ruth Dostie and Doris Prosyk of Plymouth are hard at work on a sweet task.

Together with Jeanne Wood and Sue Hoffmeister of Canton Township, they are area cookie sale chairwomen for the Huron Valley Girl Scout Council's annual event, which will continue through Feb. 12.

Helping to kick off the sale recently were nearly 500 Brownie, Junior Cadette and Senior Girl Scout contestants who participated in a clown contest.

The four women are now busily working on the sale, during which the council hopes to see 550,000 boxes of the cookies sold.

IF THIS GOAL is reached, it will mean a Girl Scout profit of \$440,000. Of this amount, \$137,500 will be used for direct troop costs. The remaining money will go to the council to insure quality programs for Scouts in Washenaw, western Wayne, Monroe and Livingston counties.

The price of a box of cookies is \$1.50. Orders are being taken now, with deliveries beginning March 1 and continuing until March 16. On sale will be seven tempting varieties.

Shortbreads, the first cookie offered in 1933, is still a favorite. But over the years the Scouts have added variety. They sell Thin Mints, Peanut Brittle Patties, Chocolate and Vanilla Sandwich Cremes, Peanut Butter Sandwiches, Old Fashioned Oatmeal and Caramel DeLites. The DeLites used to be called Sumores.

Thin Mints are vanilla cookies covered with mint chocolate icing. Peanut Butter Patties are vanilla cookies topped with peanut butter and covered with chocolate.

WHAT ARE Peanut Butter Sandwiches? Oatmeal cookies filled with peanut butter frosting.

"We've changed attitudes about women running for office. Now we're going to change numbers," she said. "Male-dominated state legislatures have turned their backs on women's rights."


That means electing candidates to local, state and national offices and obtaining appointments to government positions at all levels, she said. The





Cincinnati

Its restaurants win the Super Bowl of good eating

WHEN I THINK of Cincinnati, I don't think about football. I think of mouseline of pike, Veal Pierre, or possibly a salmon filet broiled in a copper pan and served on a bed of zucchini.

Cincinnati is one of the most underrated restaurant cities in the United States. Michael E. Comisar, manager of the Maisonet Restaurant, puts it another way:

"When people think of restaurants, they think of the East Coast, the West Coast and Florida. But does anybody think of Cincinnati?"

They think about it at Paris, the famous market place in Rang, where they pack fresh fish and send it by air every day to the Maisonet. Dover sole, brill, turbot — all stored in the fish drawers of a special ice box, padlocked and ready, just outside the restaurant's wine cellar.

They certainly think about Cincinnati when they pass out the prestigious Mobil restaurant ratings or Holiday Dining Awards. The Maisonet, one of several area restaurants run by the Comisar family, has won a Holiday award every year for 29 years. It earns Mobil's coveted five-star dining award, making it the champion of city restaurants.

But Cincinnati is not a one-restaurant town. The city has six four-star restaurants, according to Mobil, and lots of other interesting eating places prized by insiders.

THE FOUR-STAR restaurants cover a range of cuisines and are scattered all over town.

Staff trained by the Comisar family at the Maisonet played an important part in the development of two of them — the Gourmet Room, at the top of the Terrace Hotel (which opens off the Skywalk downtown) and Pigall's on Fourth Street.

La Ronde, built around a real carousel, has live music and dancing in the Carousel Inn Motel off Interstate 75 on Reading Road. The Inn has several restaurants, including the Cascade, a family place built around a swimming pool within range of electronic games for the kids.

Two of the four-stars are in the suburbs: the Heritage, a 20-minute drive northeast, and Mama Francesca's, a 20-minute drive northwest.

Mecklenburg's in the university area was originally a German beer garden. Two young men converted it to "delicate American cuisine" a few years ago, with spinach and cheese turnovers, salmon mousse and walnut-pecan black bottom pie.

Scott Hanely still runs Mecklenburg's. His former partner, Rob Fogel, now oversees the creation of homemade pasta and northern Italian foods at a restaurant called Edward's.

EDWARD'S IS NOT a four-star but it is a favorite among locals, as is the Sovereign, with its monthly jazz brunch, on Price Hill, and the riverboats run by Ben Bernstein.

Ben owns Mike Fink's Riverboat,

travel

with its raw seafood bar and fun eating, as well as two cruise-food-booze paddleboats that run year-round: the Betty Blake and the Lollipop. He will put two of his paddleboats on the Tennessee River in Knoxville during the World's Fair this year.

The Bernstein restaurant that few visitors hear about is the El Greco, across the river in Covington, Ky., where Ben and his wife keep a fabulous collection of pre-Columbian artifacts on permanent display.

And if you talk about restaurants in Cincinnati, you must mention the Golden Lamb, Ohio's oldest inn, 20 miles north in Lebanon, which runs a fine no-fuss-around 19th century American table.

AND WHO operates the Golden Lamb? The Comisar family, of course. The name is inextricably bound with good eating in the Queen City area.

Grandfather Comisar came from Russia with three brothers in the late 1920s. He did everything from selling newspapers to working in a sauerkraut factory before opening his first tiny restaurant.

One fateful New Year's Eve during the Depression, a man promised to bring a dozen people for dinner. When the party didn't show up, grandfather decided it was all over. He closed the restaurant.

In 1932, he tried again, and in 1948 the Comisars opened the Maisonet in its present location on Sixth Street. A few weeks later, grandfather died, and Grandmother Vallie and her sons took over. Over the next decades, they courted three chefs — Maurice Goro-dowski, Pierre Adrian and George Hayden.

The 1950s were lean. 1965 was decisive; that's when they decided to stay downtown in spite of inner city problems. Nowadays they run the Maisonet, Golden Lamb, and Chester's Roadhouse (it was supposed to be called Charlie's, but Detroit's own Chuck Muer opened a Charlie's Crab across the street.)

BUT THE Maisonet is the best. There are words for a restaurant like this: genuine, real, simple, unpretentious, as well as elegant and expensive. The secret? Michael E. Comisar puts it this way: "Pay attention to detail. If small details begin to seem trivial, then you start thinking that larger things are trivial, and everything fails."

Or just ask anybody on the street, about the deli food at Izzy's; the chili at the Empress, the Old Star of the Skyline; the wine-tasting-and-dinner at Meier's Wine Cellars; the Rookwood Pottery, a former pottery on Mount Adams, where they serve the classiest hamburgers in town, or...



Choirs of 7 churches to sing for Christian unity

"If the churches don't stand together in more of the major issues today, they will not have much impact. And the world needs our impact."

The speaker is the Rev. Robert C. Seltz, pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church of Livonia, and he is discussing ecumenical plans involving seven area churches in events the next two weekends.

The churches will have a pastoral exchange for services Saturday and Sunday, Jan. 30 and 31, and then on Sunday, Feb. 7, will join their choirs and congregations in an interfaith music festival.

Joining in the project, in addition to Holy Trinity, are St. Edith and St. Colette, Livonia Catholic churches; St. Timothy Presbyterian of Livonia; Church of the Savior; a Livonia congregation of the Reformed Church denomination; and two Plymouth churches, St. Kenneth Catholic and Epiphany Lutheran.

Holy Trinity, St. Edith, Church of the Savior and St. Timothy have been involved together in previous ecumenical projects.

The plans for this year, Seltz said, represent efforts to widen the scope of the cooperative effort, bringing in more congregations and greater representation from each.

"The leaders of the various denominations, you might call them the church bureaucrats, are coming out in favor of more ecumenical action," he noted. "And we pastors in western Wayne County have been working together more. But unless we get it down to the grass roots, it won't mean a thing."

THE AREA CHURCHES' major ecumenical event is the musical service scheduled at 3 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 7 in St. Timothy Presbyterian Church, 16700 Newburgh, just south of Six Mile in Livonia.

Titled "Neighborhood Festival of Music — a Celebration of Christian Unity," it will involve at least one choral group from each church and a bell choir.

Each musical group will present an anthem, and all will join in one mass number. Also included in the service will be a brief liturgy of prayers for Christian unity, and refreshments will be served during a fellowship hour after worship.

The offering to be taken will be divided between Livonia and Plymouth branches of FISH, an organization that sends volunteer helpers into the communities as needs arise.

The pastoral exchange the week before will give the most of the congregations involved the opportunity to hear a clergyman from another denomination.

Seltz will go to St. Edith for mass Satur-

day, Jan. 30, and the Rev. Dana Schultz will occupy the pulpit at Holy Trinity the next day.

The Rev. Dickson Forsythe of St. Timothy and the Rev. Gerald Dykstra of Church of the Savior will exchange pulpits, and so will the Rev. Gene Parker of Epiphany Lutheran and the Rev. William Pettit of St. Kenneth Catholic.

LEADING UP to the musical festival have been continuing ecumenical efforts on the part of several of the churches.

As Holy Week approached last week, St. Edith, Holy Trinity, St. Timothy and Church of the Savior combined efforts to urge the community to worship in their corner of Livonia.

We can learn from confrontation

In this past month, two churches in this area have experienced worship interruptions — people coming in and interrupting the sermon and the service.

One church had five such visitors on a Sunday. Two of these people broke into the worship service to castigate the minister. They told the people worshipping that they should not listen to the sermon.

In one instance a man stood up in an aggressive manner. He pointed at the minister and said, "This man speaks words of evil. I am here to expose false prophets."

The visitors are from the conservative wing of the faith. They have decided that it is not they who speak judgment upon the church. It is God who is speaking through them to warn the people. They identify with the prophets of the Old Testament. They believe that God directs them each week where to go to witness against the ministers of the churches.

SEVERAL THINGS are interesting about this phenomenon. First we note that the people who come to interrupt worship do not wish to be identified. They do not readily give their name, nor do they sign the visitors sheet. This particular group were invited to dialogue following the worship. They did not accept this invitation.

Such a confrontation also recalls the im-

age of the earliest Christians who witnessed in the town square. Here in early times they were faced with hecklers and opponents. Such visits of people who interrupt the sermon plunge the church into a market place type of setting.

It is healthy to face such opposition to one's faith. The Christian churches in Eastern Europe have faced constant opposition from the left. In this experience they have learned to recognize their own shortcomings. They have strengthened their faith. They have opened dialogue with their opponents.

IF SUCH DIALOGUE is possible, churches can be strengthened from the critics of both the right and left wings.

Many remember the recent years when people appeared in the worship services to plead the cause of racial justice. Their intention was to speak a prophetic word to their own denomination. Their goal was to appeal to the social conscience of those in the pew.

During the Vietnam war, groups would often confront their own church at conferences and in worship.

These most recent interruptors are different in that they come from outside the denominational church. They speak of judgment. When they accuse the church leaders they use a harsher language.

HOW HAVE PEOPLE reacted to such interruptions in their worship? The general reaction is that people have felt shaken and powerless. Some have felt angry. Others have confronted these interrupters by saying such things as, "Sit down, you do not speak for us."

The significant thing is that the response of the congregation has not been harsh or violent. The minister in one case offered dialogue. He was accepting yet firm about the limits which they would tolerate.

Elsewhere in the world we read of terrible violence done in the name of one religion against another. We can hope that such violent polarization will not occur within the country.

WE NEED TO REALIZE that a revival of right wing and left wing groups within our religious scene may lead to confrontation. In some of our denominations we have recently seen increased dialogue and understanding decrease polarity. This may be the case in these new confrontations.

We need to be prepared to offer dialogue and at the same time effectively stand by our own position. We can well learn from one another in such encounters.

Plymouth Salem and Westland John Glenn can't be criticized for lack of competition.

The two premier wrestling teams in the area crossed paths with a pair of the state's top-ranked Class A teams in a double-dual meet Tuesday night, squaring off against No. 2 rated Temperance-Bedford and No. 5 Hazel Park.

As expected, the host Rocks and John Glenn both took it on the chin against Bedford, but each managed to salvage the night with victories over Hazel Park before an excited and unusually large gathering at the Salem gym.

Salem, also ranked in the top 10, bombed the Vikings in the first match-up 46-12 while Glenn was suffering a 35-22 setback against the Mules.

In the nightcap, Bedford turned over the Rocks, 34-24, and Glenn, also a top-10 squad, bested Hazel Park, 39-26.


"There's two ways of coaching," said Salem's Ron Krueger, whose team is now 9-2 overall. "You can go out and wrestle nobody or you can go for the gusto like we did tonight. I don't feel bad about the outcome."

"I feel good about our overall performance," he continued. "This is one of the most exciting meets I've had."

ROCKET COACH Bob Lusk said that he, too, was happy with his team's effort against Bedford, but skeptical about his team's quest for improvement after a sheepish showing against Hazel Park.

"If I have to say that I was either pleased or displeased with how we did — I'd have to say that overall, I'm displeased," the Glenn mentor explained.

"After we wrestled well against Bedford, we lost a few that we should have

won against Hazel Park. Some of our better kids got beaten in the match.

"We kind of flattened out. And this is the time of the year where if we don't start improving, we're going to be in trouble."

In the Salem-Bedford showdown, the Mules jumped out to a 28-0 lead after five matches before the Rocks made amends.

Marty Piper, who usually competes in the heavyweight division, dropped down to wrestle Mike Calvin, a Class A runner-up last year at 200 pounds. The once-beaten Piper and Calvin tied on points, six apiece, but Piper was awarded the decision based on referee's criteria.

Rob McDonald (134 pounds) held off Bedford's highly-regarded Mike Keane 5-4.

In one of the top matches of the night, Bedford's Keith Vogel squeezed past Scott Wickens 3-0 at 187 pounds.

ANOTHER BIG match pitted Glenn's Mike Parsons (114) against Ed

Curtis of Bedford, a third-place finisher last year in Class A. Curtis escaped with a narrow 2-0 decision.

Bedford coach Bill Regnier, once a teammate of Krueger's on the Bowling Green State University mat team, praised his squad's ability adjust to new weight divisions.

"We had some kids up in the weight classes and they did a pretty good job," he said. "But this team has a lot of work to do. We're not anywhere near to perfection or where we want to be."

DOUBLE WINNERS for the Rockets on the night were Tom Gibson (105), Rob Paciocco (138), Don Forchione (155) and Aaron Ortiz, whose second match came by virtue of a default.

Ted Badami, Glenn's standout 169-pounder, is out for the season with an injury. His potential points will be sorely missed.

Salem also had a quartet of double winners — John Beaudoin (140), Bruce Bachman (147), Randy Beaudoin (157) and Piper, who wrestled one match at heavyweight and the other one at 200.

Salem matmen rule Monroe tilt

Plymouth Salem recorded four individual titles and won the team championship Saturday in the six-team Monroe Wrestling Invitational.

The Rocks, who claimed their second invitational crown of the season, tallied a team total of 163½ points.

Monroe Catholic Central, the No. 1 ranked team in Class B by the Michigan High School Wrestling Coaches Association, finished second with 135½. Rounding out the field were Ida, No. 5 in Class C, third place, 125; Monroe, fourth, 98; Tecumseh, fifth, 91; and Belleville, sixth, 84.

Bruce Bachman, Salem's standout performer at 147 pounds, continued his winning ways with a decision in the final against Ida's Steve Keister. The Salem senior upped his season mark to 33-1 with the win.

Other Salem champs included heavyweight Marty Piper, who pinned Belleville's Guy Wood in 4:45; Rob McDonald (134 pounds), who decided Mike Langton of Monroe, 4-2; and Randy Beaudoin (157), who defeated Monroe CC's Dean West 7-5.

Grabbing second-place spots, for the Rocks were John Beaudoin (140), who

lost to Monroe CC's Mike Uman in the final; John Wochuk (169), who was pinned in 2:41 by Joe Lehmann of MCC; and Scott Wickens (185), who lost to Tecumseh's Tim Connors 7-4.

THE ROCKS also took a pair of third places — Harry Walkley (200), who pinned Ida's Scott Fox in 4:57 for the consolation crown; and Mike Domanian (114), who decided Tecumseh's Ernie Vargis 10-6.

Salem's Rick Bershave (100) and Bill Hall (105) were fourth-lace finishers.

Local JUCO cagers fight bad rap

Junior college basketball. It's not highly publicized and often gets a bad rap.

The players are usually college rejects. They're either not good enough physically or have bad academic backgrounds.

Some are forced to play junior college ball because they're malcontents — unable to fit into the simplest of systems.

In Rick Telander's book "Heaven is a Playground," stories revealed how players without high school diplomas were easily admitted into success-hungry two-year institutions.

And once you get there, basketball is the only thing that matters. Attending class is an afterthought.

Some programs fit that bill. Others, fortunately, do not.

SCHOOLCRAFT, OAKLAND, St. Clair, Henry Ford and Washtenaw offer basketball programs to athletes who want to stay close to home. But of the four, Henry Ford is the only school known to have lodged athletes. And that was off campus.

A majority of the nation's top 20 junior college teams have housing facilities to entice quality talent.

Spencer Haywood started out at Trinidad (Col.). Bob McAdoo from North Carolina, Fouts Walker from Georgia and Rickey Green from Chicago made

their mark at Vincennes of Indiana.

Michigan's top team the past few years has been Jackson CC, a modern collection of buildings and dormitories in the county just outside the city limits. Head coaches Dick Versace (Bradley) and Alan Van Winkle (Southern Illinois) made the jump into big-time coaching after "paying their dues" at Jackson.

THE SCHOOL has been and continues to be a training ground for some of the best NCAA Division I and II teams in the country.

Schoolcraft coach Rocky Watkins and OCC's Leonard Cole both rely on commuters to build their basketball programs.

Watkins is not a full-time Schoolcraft faculty member. He's earned his money working the past 20 years in the Detroit Fire Department. Coaching

basketball on the junior college level is a labor of love.

A FEW of my misconceptions were erased recently when I went to see Schoolcraft, the Eastern Conference leaders, battle at nationally ranked Jackson, the Western Conference favorite.

It was bitterly cold that day. A majority of Watkins' team lives in the inner city, and some were unable to start their cars.

One player, in fact, told the coach he was going to be late because he was stranded in Willow Run. But later he was able to find other means of transportation and made it to the game.

I FOUND out that another Schoolcraft player, who lives on the east side, takes a bus each morning to get to school because he can't afford to buy a

car. Despite the obstacles, he makes all the games and practices.

After that Sunday game, won incidentally by Jackson 78-72, I came away even more impressed with what Schoolcraft was doing on the basketball floor under the direction of Watkins and assistant Danny Williams.

I saw a well-conceived offense and hustling defense. The team showed discipline, and the coach was in command.

There was no backtalk on the bench. Players came out of the game if the offense wasn't executed.

Meanwhile, the talent-laden Jackson team was far less disciplined. One player tried a dunk shot that caromed out of bounds as his team tried to protect a four-point lead with less than two minutes to go.

A MAJORITY of Watkins' players come from the Detroit Public School League. But he has also added suburban talent to complement the players from Detroit.

He demands performance in the classroom and works closely with the athletic director, Marv Gans.

These commuters, of course, hope to attain a scholarship at a four-year school. And after getting a first-hand look at the way Watkins operates, it's safe to at least take a look.

No horror stories here.
