## Schools explain training program

Many parents had doubts, but most of them left in good spirits after school administrators explained the controversial Instructional Skills Program at a recent informational session for the Plymouth-Canton Community School Council.

The program includes six half-day in-service sessions for Plymouth-Canton teachers and administrators. It is designed to increase the amount of learning in the classroom — and give additional training to staff members.

Many parents are concerned about the program, however, saying it's a waste of time and money.

"The meeting was called (to explain the program) because parents were concerned about the six half-days (students were off school) and with the expenditure reaching \$20,000," says Lynn Hoehn, president of the council, whose members include PTO parents from many of the district's elementary and middle schools.

"It's hard to make an impression on something, (from the meeting) but I would say some came in with negative feelings (about the program) and left with positive feelings."

DR. MICHAEL HOMES, assistant superintendent for instruction, says one critical goal in the instruction is to develop a common vocabulary for teachers. He says one problem with education is that there are 47 different terms for one concept.

The six half-day sessions include the following topics: essential elements of instruction and lesson design; formulating/teaching to an objective and

active participation; task analysis and diagnosis; motivation and reinforcement; retention, transfer and practice; and extending student thinking.

Most elementary and middle school teachers are more than halfway through the program. All elementary and middle schools should complete the inservice by May 13, according to Homes.

The high school teachers have gone to only one session. They may not complete the entire program this year, Homes said.

All teachers will complete the program, he added.

"To try to inservice a faculty the size of our district, we aren't going to do it effectively on a volunteer basis," Homes said.

ABOUT \$20,000 IS budgeted for this program. This total amount will not be spent, but the schools won't know how much is spent until the program is completed, Homes said.

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## High-school teachers rap in-service project

Teachers at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) attended one session of the school's Instructional Skills Program and thought it was a waste of time.

They do not want to continue this program — and have asked for modifications.

The controversial program includes six half-day in-service sessions for Plymouth-Canton teachers and administrators. It is designed to increase the amount of learning in the classroom.

David Seemann, spokesman for the Plymouth-Canton Teachers' Guild, says teachers are enthusiastic about in-service training — but not what is offered through the Instructional Skills Program.

"It was too elementary (the teaching principles) for the level we are at," Seemann said about the first session. "It was like a review of a junior level college course."

subject from the teachers," Seemann added. "It was that misread from administration."

"I think it's general knowledge that the format was incorrect for our needs. They (administration) would like this thing to disappear because it's been a bombshell."

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## Wage hikes to be 'minimal at best'

Township employees may be asked to bite the bullet on wages this year.

Department heads recently received a 5 percent raise by the Township Board — about half the increase recommended by a pay advisory commission.

The board voted to make another salary review around Aug. 1, pending completion of a new pay grade and performance appraisal system by the township's merit commission.

While that could bring additional

raises for some department heads, it isn't likely, said finance director Mike Gorman. He predicts "minimal — if anything" pay raises for other township employees, as well.

"I think the board is looking at it (wages) as an austerity budget," explained Gorman. "The economic situation is bad. I think they are looking at it all around. I don't think any additional increase is probable."

THE 1982 budget allows a raise of 9 percent for about a dozen non-union department heads and a 7 percent hike for township employees who belong to bargaining units.

Contracts for about 110 township employees will expire at various points this year. This group of separate bargaining units includes firefighters, police, department of public works (DPW) and clerical workers.

The merit commission, which makes recommendations on salaries and duties for the department heads, has been

working for several months on a new, graded pay system.

The system would be based on both merit and duties and have several ranges for flexibility. It would include an appraisal method for determining "merit" raises.

In the past, raises have tended to be across-the-board for all department heads.

IN RECENT reports to the Township Board, the merit commission "strongly" recommended the 9 percent raises for department heads, to bring salaries

more in line with pay scales in nearby communities.

Commission reports conclude that Canton department heads earn an average of 16 percent less than their counterparts elsewhere. The survey, completed last fall, included Ann Arbor, Waterford Township, Westland, Southgate, Clinton Township, Wayne, Inkster, Garden City, Plymouth, Allen Park and Dearborn Heights.

The current raise will put the police and fire chiefs, DPW superintendent

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## Man faces assault charges in Canton hammer attack

A 39-year-old Canton man has been charged with attacking his estranged wife and stepdaughter with a hammer last weekend.

The alleged attack took place about 8 p.m. March 12 in the couple's home on Haggerty Road near Van Born, police said.

Randal Cochran was arraigned March 13 at the outcounty branch of the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office on two counts of assault with intent to murder, and one count of using a fire-

arm while committing a felony.

Woodhaven Judge Andrea Ferrara entered an innocent plea in Cochran's behalf, and set bond at \$75,000 cash.

A preliminary hearing in 35th District Court will be March 22.

ACCORDING TO a police report, Cochran and his wife Marjorie, 41, are involved in a divorce suit.

The report indicates Mrs. Cochran was hit on the head, face and chest with a carpenter's hammer. She suffered a broken nose, bruises and cuts.

Mrs. Cochran also told police she had been threatened with a shotgun. Her 14-year-old daughter by a previous marriage was hit on a knee and foot, according to the report.

Cochran was arrested a few hours after the incident by Van Buren Township police.

Assault with intent to murder carries a maximum penalty of life imprisonment upon conviction. Use of a firearm in commission of a felony carries a two-year prison term.

# Poole tackles financial issues

Supervisor James Poole is sharpening his pencil to tackle fiscal concerns which he believes could affect the future economic strength of Canton.

In a March 4 letter to the Township Board, Poole outlined some of these concerns. Several dealt with overtime, compensatory time, pension benefits and "banked" sick pay.

These topics may be discussed at a future board meeting.

"Although the township is in a stable financial position at the present time, these situations could cause extreme financial hardship in the future," Poole said in his letter.

FOR EXAMPLE, the township paid \$156,000 in overtime during 1981, compared to \$130,000 for 1980.

The fire department accounts for most of the overtime, followed by the public works and police departments, said Gorman.

Firefighters work an average 56 hours a week, and they receive overtime after 54 hours, by state law. There also are minimum staffing requirements which are a factor, said Gorman.

Emergencies sometimes cause overtime.

POOLE RECENTLY stopped a long-standing police department practice of giving four hours' compensatory time to detectives who are on standby during weekends in case they're needed for an investigation.

Standard practice is to pay a standby employee only if he or she comes into work. The practice, discovered in a routine check of payroll records, apparently had been established several years ago by a previous police chief.

It was continued by present Chief Jerry Cox, according to Gorman. The detective could either take the time off or be paid for the hours.

"The idea isn't bad," said Gorman, "but it creates administrative problems because of inconsistency between departments."

"WE DON'T know for sure how long it has been going on," added Gorman. "I don't think we're talking about a lot of dollars."

Cox said he understands Poole's wish to cut costs, but he believes compensatory time was a "fair practice." He believes it gave incentive to detectives, who receive patrolman's wages yet possess specialized investigative skills.

Poole also has expressed concerns about "banked" sick pay, which is paid off when an employee leaves the township. Employees are allowed to bank a portion of unused days, resulting in a payoff of thousands of dollars for long-time employees.

Currently, said Poole, the township has a liability of \$250,000 for this sick pay, and there is no provision for payment.

"The township hasn't set money aside," said Gorman. "We will be starting this year a sick-pay reserve fund to offset some of that liability."

POOLE ALSO believes the 20-

month vesting period in the township's pension plan is "much too liberal."

The plan, adopted in the late 1960s, was sold during a period when most township officials were serving two-year terms (now they serve four years).

The pension covers all full-time township employees, including elected officials. Many townships have similar plans, said Gorman.

It means any employee becomes "vested," or eligible to collect benefits paid into the pension plan after 20 months employment.

Many pension plans in the private

sector allow vesting after several years' employment, often 10 years.

POOLE AND Gorman believe cuts done now will strengthen the township's financial position, delaying any future economic "crunch."

"Canton is a relatively young community," said Gorman. "We haven't gotten into the pattern of the other communities (with large capital investments and hefty union contracts).

"We have watched our p's and q's so we don't put ourselves into that position," Gorman added.

and finance director in the \$30,000-per-year range. Other administrators will be in the low-to-high \$20,000 range.

The township board members expressed satisfaction with the current performance of department heads, but indicated a desire to see the completed pay system and performance-appraisal guidelines being developed by the merit commission.

"Unless there is a performance appraisal somewhere along the line, we are going to be faced with across-the-board increases for all these employees for the foreseeable future," said trustee Steve Larson.

"The outstanding employees — if they are behind — unfortunately, are going to remain that way," Larson added.

Some trustees said it would be unfair for department heads to receive a lower percentage raise than employees who are members of a union. Others said raises should stay low at this time because of Michigan's poor economy and cuts or concessions being made by employees in the private sector.

MEANWHILE, township officials will be negotiating new contracts with all bargaining units this year.

Talks have just begun between the township and the police command officers' unit.

## ESY students hit the lanes

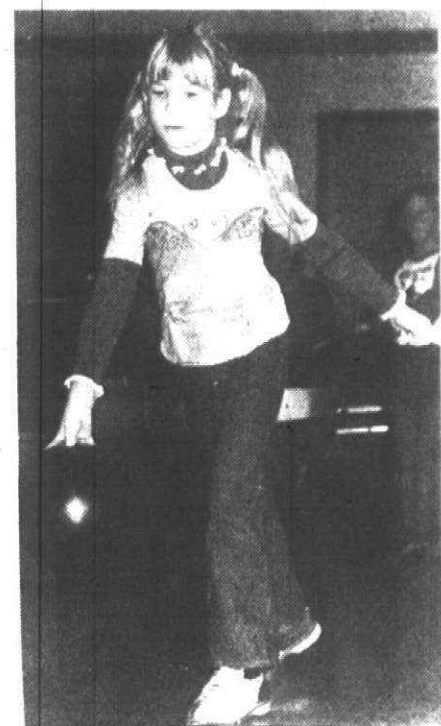
The championship of the annual bowling tournament for students on the Extended School Year (ESY) program took place yesterday at the Super Bowl Lanes, on Ford Road in Canton.

## Call of the woodpecker a sure sign of spring

The little black dog and I had many acres of fields and woods overlooking the Rouge River to ourselves.

Then, from a stand of dead trees in what would be a swamp in a few weeks, came a rat-a-tat-tat sound of spring: a woodpecker.

Which species I couldn't tell. Despite the lack of foliage, I never spotted the red-headed drummer. The hairy and downy woodpeckers are most common in these parts.

Why is a woodpecker's sound a sign of spring? The woodpecker is an all-year resident of Michigan, according to Mark Szabo, a Kensington Metropark naturalist.

**BUT IF** three-fourths of a woodpecker's diet is bugs, then how can he survive? Other bug-eaters fly south.

"If you tear back the bark on your firewood," Szabo said, "you'll find beetles who are dormant. They'll begin moving fast enough when it warms up. Woodpeckers can feed on them all winter long."

Well, then: If woodpeckers are around all winter, why don't we hear them until early March? You'd think they would be easy to hear in the clear winter air.

"I didn't hear any myself until just a couple of days ago," Szabo replied. "They make no sound when they're feeding in soft, rotted stumps where the beetles are."

"But in spring the males begin make a loud tapping in order to attract mates. Sometimes in cities they tap on a house to call a mate. That's when people find them a nuisance."

**MOST SPECIES** of woodpeckers have white backs and some red on their heads. The hairy woodpecker is 10 inches long with a 17-inch wing spread; the downy, only six inches long with a 12-inch wing spread.

They will nest in the spot where I heard the male — dead trees, five to 50 feet high. The hairy will hatch three to five eggs, the downy four to six.

If the male woodpecker says it's spring, well, his word is good enough for me.

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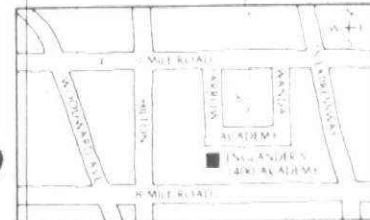
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# Parents question skills training Schools explain inservice plan

Additional transportation expenses to bus the students home early costs about \$7,000 of the \$20,000, according to Homes.

Approximately \$6,500 was paid to the Waterford School District last fall when a group of 65 Plymouth-Canton teachers and administrators experienced similar sessions before it was launched districtwide in Plymouth-Canton last month.

Another \$4,000 pays for substitute teachers

(while teachers were in Waterford's sessions), food, travel and materials, Homes said.

The program, approved by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education, falls within the limitations of the 1981-82 school budget, school officials said.

"It seems reasonable to go for the completion of the training program for all staff this year," officials said in a printed statement. "Accomplishment of total training during 1981-82 would put us in a situation of consistent followup and reinforcement in the years ahead."

# High-school teachers balk at program

TEACHERS ALREADY have formed a committee to modify the program at the high schools, Seemann said. Meanwhile, CEP teachers have developed their own full-day inservice for Friday. Programs will cover: alcohol, the family and the classroom; stress overview; writing in the content areas; legal rights of teachers and students; and use of microcomputer to teach mathematics.

Although the last five session of the Instructional Skills Program have not been scheduled at the CEP, Dr. Michael Homes, assistant superintendent

for instruction, said the high schools will complete the program — although it may extend into the next school year.

Kent Buikema, principal at Plymouth Canton High School, said it's not a question of "whether" — it's a question of "how" the program is completed.

"I wouldn't say they (teachers) are going to have all six half-days," Buikema said. "There is a strong feeling from the staff that half-days are disruptive to the educational program at the high schools. ELEMENTARY AND Middle school staffs have completed at least three of the six session in the Instructional Skills Program. All elementary and

middle schools are scheduled to complete the program by May 13.

Candi Reece, chief negotiator for the Plymouth-Canton Education Association (PCEA), the teachers' union, says elementary schools did not fight administration on this program.

"Some of the teachers like it, but many of us found it was a waste of time," Reece says. "They are just putting us through things we already know. We'd much rather be teaching."

"It's fine to have an inservice if you gain something from it, but we aren't," Reece adds.

## Holbrook gets life in prison

Darol W. Holbrook was sentenced to life in prison for the Dec. 3 rape and murder of 27-year-old Plymouth Township resident Janet Reynolds Tuesday.

Holbrook, 31, of Wyandotte, was convicted March 9 of first degree murder during a rape. He was sentenced by Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Charles Kaufman.

The former Northville Regional Hospital employee was arrested after Plymouth police found Reynolds' naked body in a field the day after her disappearance.

Reynolds was last seen leaving

Plaza Bowling Lanes, 42001 E. Ann Arbor Road, with Holbrook the night of Dec. 3. Police were called when she failed to meet friends later that night.

Reynolds had been beaten, strangled and stabbed to death. Blood matching Reynolds' type was found splattered on Holbrook's shoes along with bruises on his arms and leaves and grass found in his car.

A Wayne County Medical Examiner's examination of Reynolds' body rendered sperm matching Holbrook's blood type.

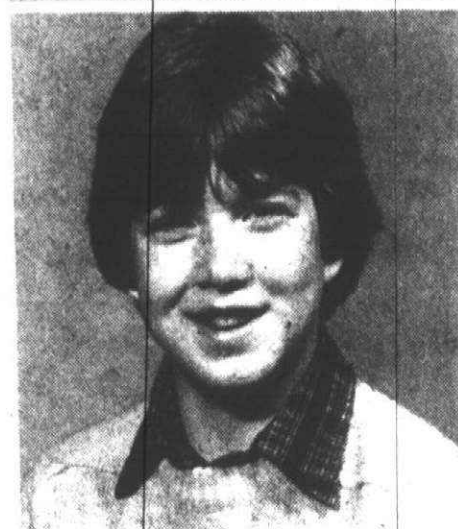
Shannon, 13, is a seventh grader at Pioneer Middle School where he has a B+ grade average.

# Schools halt community college plans

Wayne-Westland school district trustees have decided to table indefinitely a highly-criticized community college plan.

"My understanding is that the proposal is dead unless there is a tremendous turnaround," said board trustee Fred Warmbier after the school board decision last week.

Superintendent Timothy Dyer said that district staff may still study the proposal for a community college in the Wayne-Westland district to find out "what went wrong." He said the staff will also keep an eye out for legislation that would make operation of a vocationally-oriented community college financially attractive.

The plan for a community college in the district met with strong opposition at the first of four public hearings. Three other planned hearings were subsequently cancelled.

Opposition surfaced again at the board meeting last week as the board accepted petitions with 1,800 signatures opposing the kindergarten through grade 14 plan.

BEFORE VOTING on the tabling motion, the board "amended" the

motion to require that a referendum vote by district residents be held if the plan is ever brought before the board again. The actual effect of the amendment is uncertain.

Board Trustee Thomas Barrett and President Donald Rusnock voiced doubt over whether a motion to table could be amended and concern about committing a future school board to a referendum. According to Robert's Rules of Order, no other motion can be attached to a motion to table.

Trustee David Moranty, who urged passage of the amendment, suggested that the board get legal advice on the issue. But the board voted 5-0 on the referendum amendment, saying all trustees agreed that a referendum should be held. Board members Mildred Batterson and Ken Marshall were

absent from the meeting.

"It will probably be well over a year and probably in excess of that before we bring this back to you," Dyer told the board. "This is the best of times for a community college in terms of the need for job training, but it's the worst in terms of the economic climate."

Although Moranty favored a motion that would kill the proposal outright, other board members said they favored a motion to table because it would take a yes vote from four board members to reconsider it. If the community college proposal had been rescinded, any board member could have resubmitted the idea at any time without the approval of three other board members.

Several board members said that they thought the K-14 idea may still have some merit.

"It's a good idea at the wrong time," said Barrett. "Most of us believe that you vote your district. With significant opposition, properly so is the order to table it for the time being."

"I take exception to comments made outside of this community, particularly from the Schoolcraft official who said the proposal was to protect administrative jobs," he continued. "That was never the issue. (The speaker) was totally mistaken and didn't know what he was talking about."

BEVERLY KONKRITE, who had presented the petitions to the board, said she would continue to collect signatures in opposition to the community college. She said that the 1,800 signatures were collected by about 10 people within a three-week period.

In a letter to the state board of education, Konkrite said, "We intend to prove, indeed, that the taxpayers of the Wayne-Westland school district are extremely opposed to expanding our current K-12 institution."

Konkrite said that the petition drive started after she began discussing the proposal with her neighbors.

"We test the car on the dynamometer, set the dwell and timing, balance and adjust the carburetor for best mileage, run a final test and give it to the customer precision tuned — usually within 45 minutes.

Kathy Spencer, the area sub-franchiser, opened the first outlet in Michigan in January 1980 at Warren and Middlebelt in Westland.

"We hire only state licensed mechanics," said Spencer.

"In times like these," she said, "people are conservative enough to try to hold on to their existing cars and to make them go as far as possible before trading them in.

"This means getting a tune-up is necessary, especially to get the best fuel mileage."

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# Property tax assessment battle is broadening

Increases in property tax assessments have resulted in at least two nearby municipalities calling for a change in the method of determining market value.

Plymouth Township is using a 12-month sales sample instead of the traditional 30-month period, and Sumpter Township is arguing that "creative financing" is inflating home values and is not being accounted for.

R. William Joyner, D-Plymouth, also has asked that the State Tax Commission take into account the impact of creative financing on property assessments. Joyner is a Wayne County commissioner whose 27th District includes Canton, Plymouth, Sumpter, Northville, Van Buren, Wayne, Belleville and part of Westland.

DAVID E. RUTLEDGE, supervisor of Superior Township, said that in 1982 Washtenaw County is taking into consideration the impact of creative financing on property values.

As a result, Washtenaw County has come up with a "negative" (less than 1) state equalized valuation (SEV) factor of 0.95770, which it is spreading on property countywide.

"It is almost certain that the state will not agree with this procedure," said Rutledge. "The county, with our support, has vowed to fight the state in court should the state equalized value exceed the county equalized value."

Rutledge claims that if the state comes up with an SEV factor of 1.0 or higher, then property in Superior Township will be assessed at more than

50 percent of market value. (The state comes up with its SEV factors for each county by the fourth Monday in May).

By applying a negative factor, Washtenaw County is lowering assessed value in each of its municipalities by 4 percent (4.23 percent).

JOYNER IS supporting a Wayne County Board of Commissioners resolution asking the State Tax Commission to consider the impact of creative financing when determining fair and equitable assessments under the law.

Joyner claims that more than 80 percent of the new homes now being sold in Wayne County use some form of creative financing.

"I join with the Washtenaw County assessors in condemning the State Tax Commission for its refusal to recognize the fact that creative financing is a way of life today," Joyner said.

Joyner said the resolution being introduced in Wayne County asks local

assessors, when reviewing equalization factors, to exclude from sales data such items as:

Amounts paid for obtaining financing of the purchase price of the property; amounts attributable to personal property which were included in the purchase price; and amounts paid for surveying the property pursuant to its sale.

"We must do all possible to ease the burden of property tax increases. This is one way we can save potentially \$100 or \$200 in property taxes in some areas," Joyner said.

PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP is using a 12-month sample of residential sales to determine 1982 market value — a practice contrary to the Wayne County

Bureau of Taxation, which this year is using a 30-month sample.

The State Tax Commission, however, has stated that a 12-month sample is permissible under the law, and it would uphold use of a 12-month sample if there are sufficient sales included to reflect current value.

Bob Vandermark, chairman of the State Tax Commission, said a 12-month sample is allowed in a real estate market in which values are substantially declining.

Plymouth Township Supervisor Maurice Breen has hired Plymouth attorney James McCarthy to defend the township if Wayne County applies a factor higher than 1.0 to the township.

Currently the Plymouth Township Board of Review is lowering most

property assessments, when owners appeal, by 10 percent to bring 1982 value back to the 1981 level.

Breen and other local officials said they feel the current large number of appeals being made are more a reflection of the increase in 1981 values than the hikes proposed for 1982.

Because of the equalization by class law, residential assessed values increased by 20-20 percent in the Plymouth-Canton and surrounding areas in 1981. Homeowners who pay taxes to a mortgage company or bank through an escrow account, however, weren't notified of the change until the end of 1981.

In the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township, residential values are increasing by about 10 percent in 1982.

# Nobody takes blame for high assessments

**N**OBODY WANTS TO accept responsibility for the continued increases in property tax assessments.

Local officials, depending on whom they are, will blame either the state or county. The county blames the state, and the state puts the burden of equity back on the county.

Wayne County is using a 30-month study of real estate sales to determine current market value. In so doing, it has "inflated" value by including 1979, when houses were selling at prime rates.

The State Tax Commission has gone on record that any county in Michigan may use a 12-month sales sample (if there are a reasonable number of sales in that year) because the house market is in a substantial decline.

CANTON TOWNSHIP is using a 12-month sample for 1982 assessments. It used a 30-month average for 1981 assessments. Some county commissioners, incorrectly, suggest the 30-month study is a state requirement. The city is preparing to join that suit.

Other county officials argue that "creative financing" has artificially raised sales prices of real estate and such transactions should be deleted when determining assessed values.

While the buck-passing continues, the lines continue to form at township hall as residents appeal their property assessments for 1982.

And residents are correct in making the appeal. The equalization-by-class law of 1981 should have resulted in residential values throughout Wayne County being very close to 50 percent of market value — as required by the Michigan Constitution. Many assumed that's why assessments last year went up 20 and 25 percent — to bring houses up to the 50-percent level.

If that is what happened, then why are values increasing by 10 percent in 1982 when the market is at a virtual standstill? The only explanation is that the 30-month average reflects a 10-percent increase because 1979 sales figures still are included.

HOMEOWNERS WOULD be wise, though, to do more than merely appeal their assessments this month. Assessments are only one-half of the formula that results in higher taxes being paid at year's end. The other half is the rate of taxation.

If assessments go up, taxes do not automatically have to rise.

Township boards and school boards have the option any year to lower the tax rate. So, after appealing your assessment, don't give up.

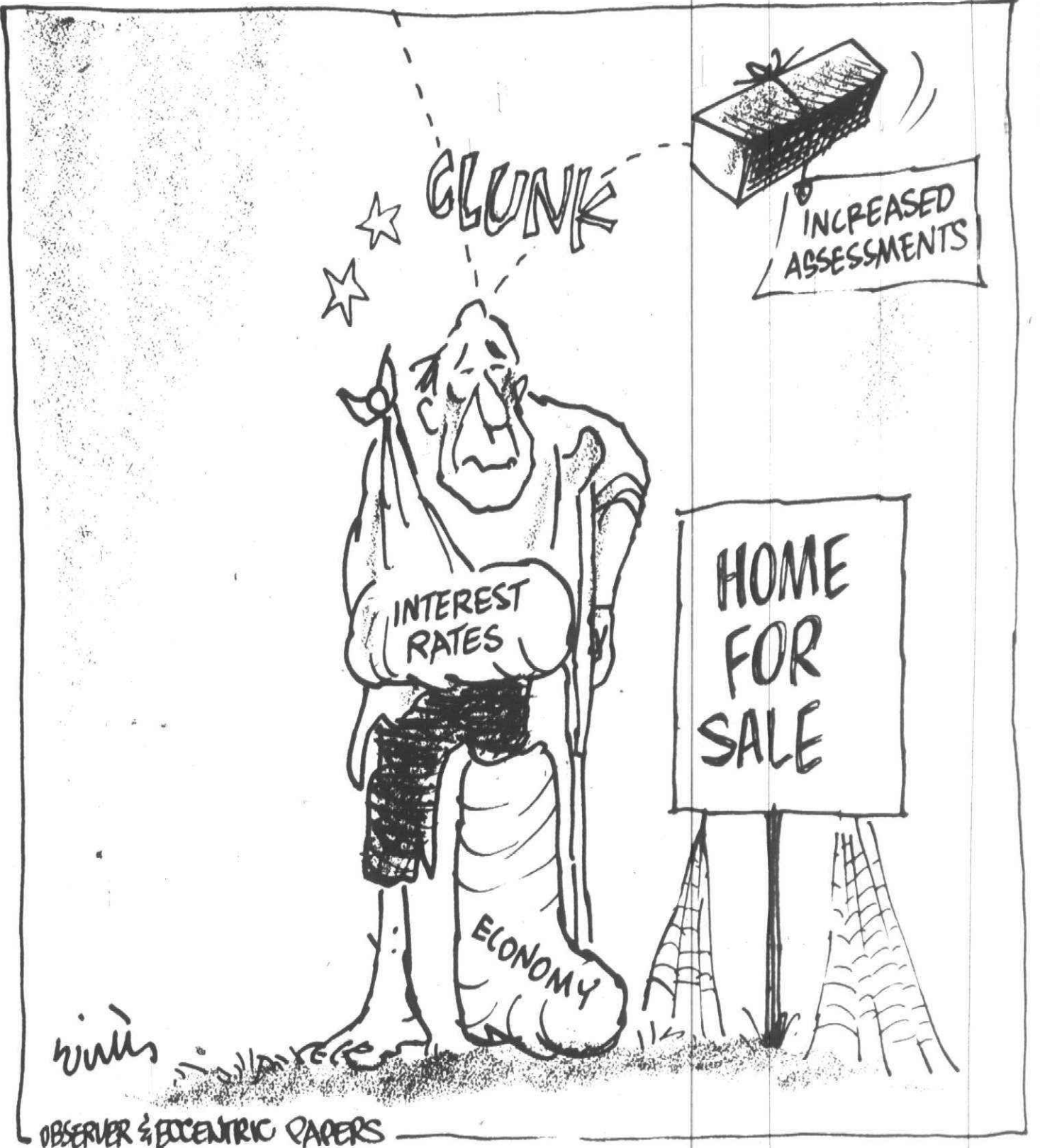
A new law (truth in taxation) provides that governments cannot collect more revenue as a result of increased assessments unless they hold public hearings. If assessments rise, and public hearings are not held, local governments must reduce their tax rates so they collect no more money than they did last year.

In the past, lowering the tax rate as assessments rose was optional. Now it's law — unless a hearing is held to let residents know that the governing body plans to collect more money than in the previous year.

So the other half of the fight for those now appealing assessments is to watch what Canton's township board and local school boards do with tax rates when operating budgets are adopted.

If assessments increase, then state aid for local school districts decrease — however, total school income still may rise.

The money may be needed. But you will want to hear the facts. In past years, budget hearings have been attended by a handful. Hopefully, in 1982, attendance will increase substantially.



## Assessments continue to soar, despite a recession

It's rare that one story dominates all newspapers in the Observer & Eccentric group. But such was the case last week.

Boards of review convened to listen to homeowners' complaints about property assessments. And homeowners in record numbers let their local government officials know what they thought of their assessments.

"We're in a depressed economy, and my assessment has gone up every year in the past four years," said a man in Livonia.

A West Bloomfield man said, "I make a good living. I love this country. I lived in Europe nine years, and it's better here. But lies are lies. My house did not go up 5 percent in value."

From Troy came the complaint: "The real estate market in '81 is not what it was in '78, '79 or even '80. I can't get from my home what I would have gotten last year. We have not sold a home in my subdivision."

A man from Redford said he almost had a heart attack when he saw his \$2,480 tax bill. "I have been in my house since 1952, and I never complained before," he said.

Volunteers sit on boards of review. Once a year they hear complaints from property owners who are dissatisfied with assessments. These assessments are the basis for the property taxes later paid by the homeowner.

**WHY THE INCREASED** anger this year?

Obviously, the economy has much to do with it. Many more persons are unemployed this year than last year. Others have had their salaries reduced. They can't afford more taxes.

But just as importantly, people are not buying homes today. Because of unemployment and high interest rates, many potential home buyers are out of the market. It's hard for a homeowner to see his

assessment raised when he knows he has little chance of selling his home.

Troy Assessor Ernest Reschke has heard of some houses selling \$20,000 to \$50,000 below the original asking price. If property assessments are going up at the same time, you can understand the anger.

In addition, a new state law went into effect this year. Public Act 114 requires that factors used to equalize tax assessment at 50 percent of market value be applied by class of property — residential, commercial, industrial and agricultural.

Before, all the property in a community was lumped together and a factor applied. This new law has had the effect of lifting the tax burden off busi-

ness at the homeowners' expense.

**THIS COMBINATION** of factors has swamped local boards of review.

They report record numbers of appeals. For example, Plymouth, which usually has 20-30 appeals, had 150 after its first two days of a four-day session.

It has not been easy for those who have volunteered to serve on the boards. As Julie Ball of Livonia said after listening to a widow with three children, "It's not hard to relate to the situation, but for the grace of God it could be any one of us."

If this is not a tax revolt, it is a rebellion. What's happening at our suburban boards of review tells us volumes about the disposition of local taxpayers.

Smart politicians are watching carefully. Taxpayers just are not willing to give any more. Are you listening, Gov. Milliken?

The alternative to levying more taxes is to make additional cuts in government budgets. It looks like we can expect more cuts.

Things had gone along smoothly until some mothers complained it was a shame the paper needed money so badly that their sons' blood had to be spilled to get it.

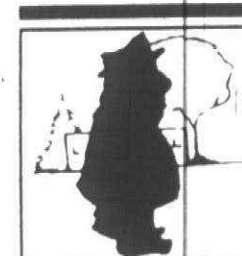

One afternoon, The Stroller sat across from Norris and asked for a reduction in the rent as a charitable move, hoping the idea would be readily accepted.

Norris listened attentively. Then he said, "We don't get anything for nothing in your paper. You folks show no charity to the Olympia. So why not continue on a business basis? You pay your bills, and we will pay ours."

The Stroller was almost speechless. Then he countered, "I'll sign the contract as it is, but I'd like to tell you something. If you figured you are not getting anything for nothing in our paper, starting today we will have no full-time hockey writer. **FINE. HOCKEY** news was cut down — for a while.

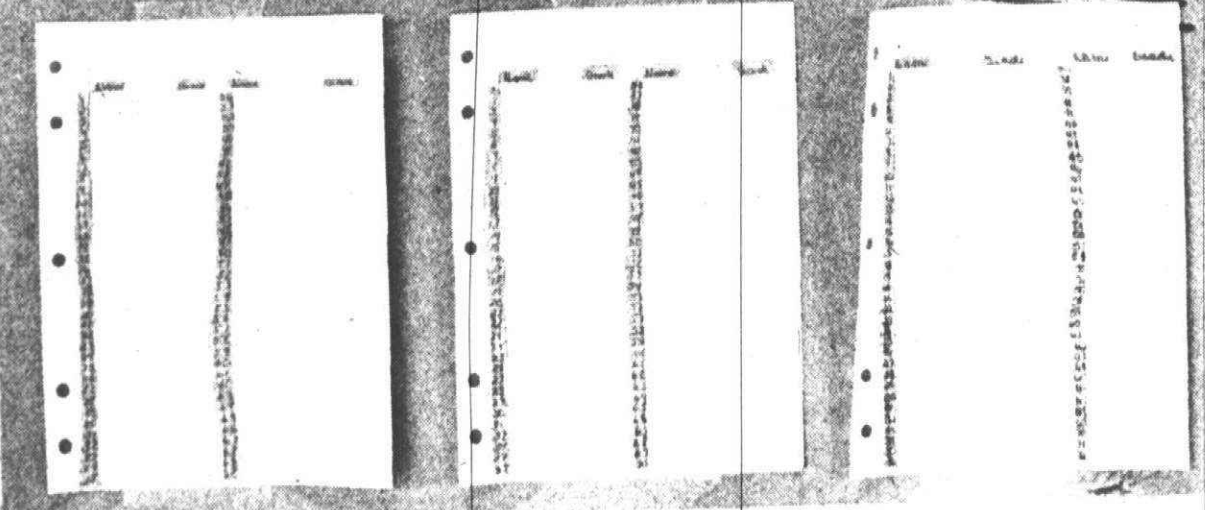
Then something happened. The Wings started mowing down opponents and easily made the playoffs.

## Vacant Eloise buildings readied for demolition

Vacant buildings at the Wayne County General Hospital complex in Westland, all unoccupied for at least five years, are being evaluated by two committees of the County Board of Commissioners for either new uses or demolition.

Last week the board ways and means committee recommended that county auditors seek bids for razing 12 old structures on the grounds. The human resources committee authorized a study group to report recommendation.

Members of the committee are Commissioners Thomas Presnell, chairman, Westland; R. William Joyner, Plymouth; James Beyster, chief of the auditor's buildings division responsible for county property; N. McKinley Tounsel, of the county office of corporation counsel; and a representative of the Westland mayor's office yet to be named.

FINAL DECISION on use or disposal of the buildings will come from the full 27-member board of commissioners after receiving reports from both committees.

The buildings under consideration are D, H, I, K and L, the cafeteria, brick cottage, brick bungalow, gardner's cottage, two root cellars and the auditorium.

Estimated demolition cost is \$743,000. According to the auditors, the buildings have broken windows, are unheated and have been vandalized, and are "deteriorated beyond the point of reversion."

According to a joint report from the building division and the county Planning Commission, none of the structures are considered historic. Although some small mementos in the buildings could be removed and preserved, there are very few items remaining with usable or antique value, says the report.

Most valuable items in the buildings have already been removed for use in other county buildings. Any other materials of value will be considered by contractors when submitting bids, says the report.

## Jail population stays high, 903 is goal

Repeat offenders, who accounted for 700 of 900 prisoners retried by Recorder's and Circuit judges during February, will cost Wayne County taxpayers an additional \$1.2 million this fiscal year, according to Commissioner Edward K. Michalski.

There is no way to speed up adjudication of prisoners in order to keep jail population at an 800-a-day level, said Executive Chief Circuit Judge Richard Dunn and Chief Recorder's Judge Samuel Gardner. The two appeared last week before the public safety and judiciary committee. They finally agreed to try holding the jail to 903 inmates.

The committee, chaired by Michalski, is attempting to provide adequate jail staffing at both the county facility in downtown Detroit and Westland M Building Annex through the rest of the fiscal year.

ALTHOUGH THE new 36th District Court has attempted to reduce jail population through speedy trials, Judges Dunn and Gardner contend the state, in an effort to save money, is "furloughing" prisoners from Jackson at an alarming rate.

"It troubles me," said Gardner, "that offenders

are being released back on the streets, some within 47 days of being remanded to state prison facilities."

In addition to problems with repeaters and a general increase in crime as the result of the economic situation, Dunn and Gardner point to slowdown by the Ypsilanti State Forensic Center in processing suspected mental cases among prisoners being held for trial.

"Better than 80 of the prisoners being held in the county jail today are awaiting forensic examination," Dunn said.

"Under present statutes, all such examinations

must be conducted by the Ypsi Forensic Center, and each one is running from 90-140 days behind schedule. As the result, suspected mentally ill prisoners are being forced to sit in the county jail to await their turn. If we could get the statutes changed, the county could reduce the waiting period to days or hours and ease jail crowding."

There are indications already the county may be forced to reopen barracks at the DeHoCo facility in Plymouth Township to handle an expected surge in crime this spring and summer, Michalski said.



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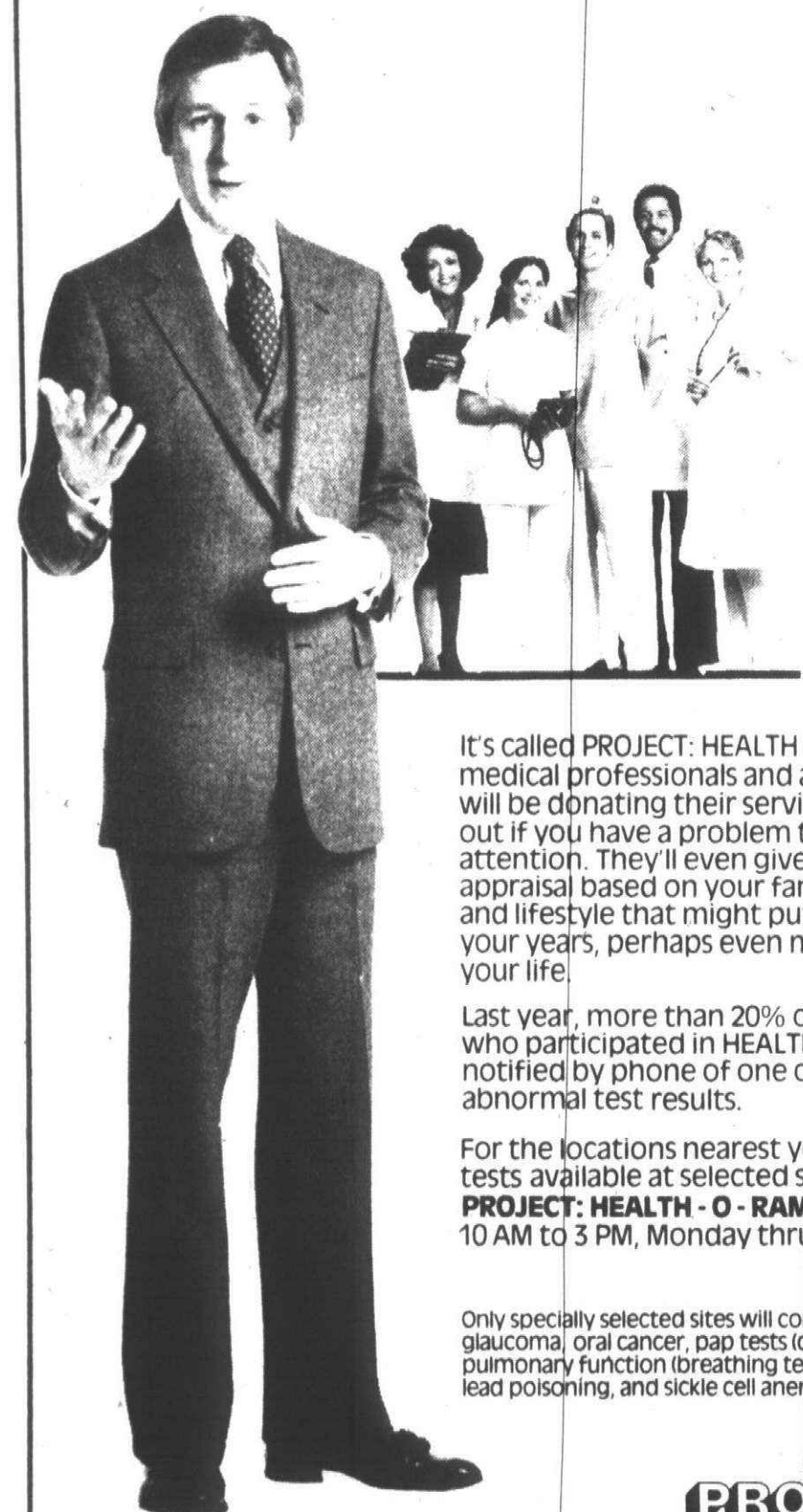

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## Phone calls reduce services

To the editor:

I welcome the change in the Centennial Educational Park (CEP) attendance policy and would like to add a further perspective on the use of teacher time for attendance calls.

Asking whether the teacher has "time" for such calls is perhaps not a broad enough question (setting aside for the moment the effectiveness of the calls). Rather, the question should be, do we want to spend a portion of such a powerful resource in such a manner?

Using figures gathered by the CEP Attendance Committee last fall shows that the average teacher was spending a little less than one-half hour per week on the task. I personally feel the evaluation instrument left out other hidden time expenditure, but sticking with these figures one can see that the teachers were spending 15.5 hours per school year on the phone.

The amounts to a full three weeks of teacher planning time. Extend this to the entire CEP teaching staff and the figure is 2,310 hours per school year, or a total of 462 planning weeks being borrowed from instruction for the calls.

This is the same as having 13 or 14 teachers on the phone one hour per day, every day, or two teachers on the phone all day, every day, for the entire school year. This cost in terms of money could easily be \$60,000 (not counting the phone bill).

Since these figures don't show up in the budget balance sheet, it's easy to overlook the real cost. The most inefficient aspect of the policy is, and was, the redundancy factor. Five or six teachers call on the same student. Although this may have a dramatic impact on the household receiving the calls, the efficiency factor is about the same as driving semi-tractor trailer to the store to buy a loaf of bread.

As an English teacher, I read, and comment on, 50,000 words of student writing per week, and have an average of 3,000 student contact hours per

month. I believe the community is getting good service for good money; but, make no mistake, using this powerful resource to make phone calls as per the attendance policy ultimately reduces the service teachers can provide students.

## Free health check-up offered

Health tests worth up to \$150 will be offered free April 3 at Plymouth Canton High School as part of Project Health-O-Rama.

The tests are designed to detect disease during the initial stages of development, enabling early treatment and aiding in the prevention of illness.

The tests include anemia, blood pressure, vision, blood chemistry tests, health hazard appraisal, height and weight, counseling and referral.

The free health tests are offered at 60 lo-

cations in seven counties by WXYZ-TV, Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Michigan, and United Health Organizations.

At many of the locations, tests will be given for glaucoma, hearing loss, sickle cell anemia, cancer and breathing difficulties.

The only test that is not free is an optional blood chemistry panel, which will cost \$7.

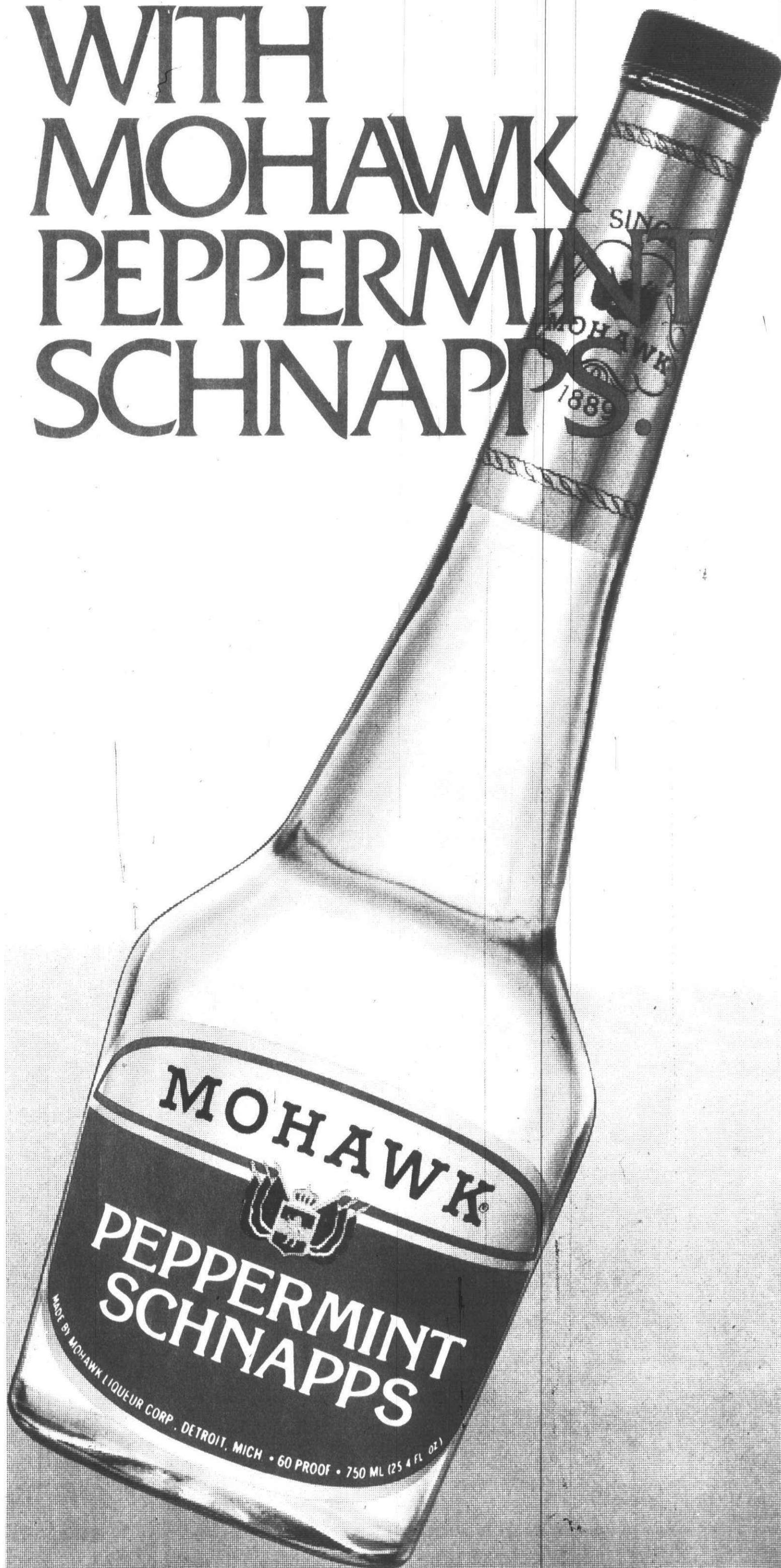
Residents may find out what tests will be offered at Plymouth Canton High by calling 353-8900 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday-Friday.

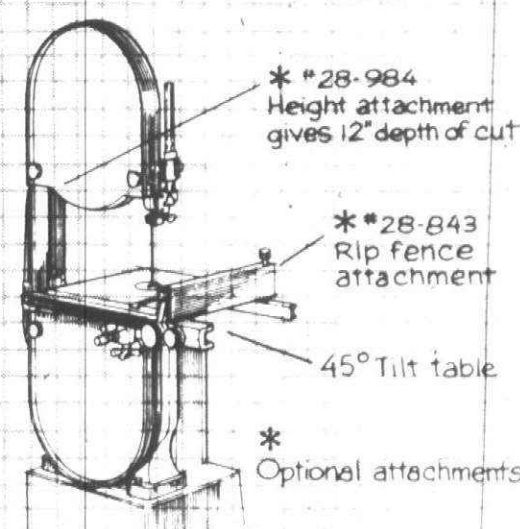

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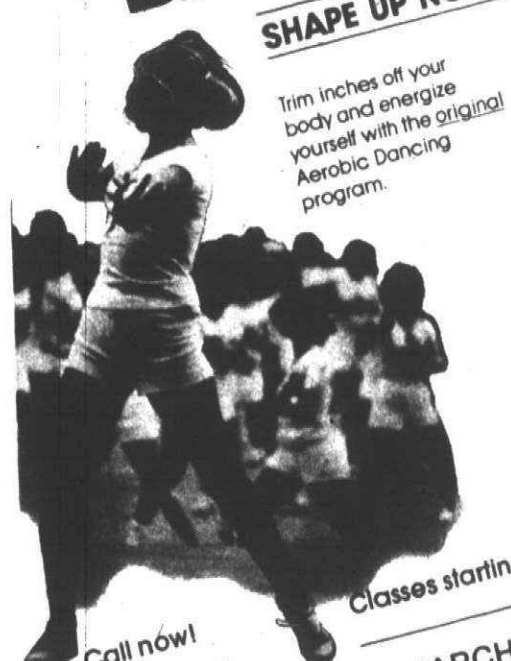

# Belleek Pottery

## From the kilns of a small Irish village comes a treasure in china

**B**ELLEEK, Northern Ireland: Half of this tiny village is in Northern Ireland, and the other half is in the Republic of Ireland to the south. But that is not what makes the village famous. Catching a fish in one country and landing it in another is only a minor form of notoriety.

The few thatched-roofed cottages left in this part of County Fermanagh shine with a special luster, but that's not what makes Belleek famous either, although it's getting closer.

What puts this town on the map is an opalescent porcelain, much of it decorated with tiny green shamrocks, known to china lovers throughout the world as Belleek.

It gives new luster to an old treasure when you see it made in its setting, as I did here in this tiny village near Lough Erne, in the Lake District of Northern Ireland. The road winds out of gentle emerald hills down the two-block main street of town and turns left across the River Erne to a huge, three-story brick building that dominates the river and the bridge: Belleek Pottery Limited.

An irritated Irish government official noted nearly 400 years ago that the people in this part of Northern Ireland were better craftsmen than swordsmen.

But they didn't have much to craft in Belleek until a man named John Caldwell Bloomfield inherited the Castle Caldwell estate after the great famine killed a million Irish people in 1849.

**JOHN WAS MORE** interested in mineralogy and ceramics than he was in farming. What was he to do to support the tenants on his estate, which included the village of Belleek itself?

It was those shining, whitewashed cottage walls gleaming with an unusual kind of limestone that made the young estate owner start looking for something that had never before been found in the area: feldspar and kaolin, the clays needed to make fine porcelain.

He found it five miles from home, and in 1857, with the help of a man from the Worcester Royal Porcelain Works, launched the pottery that would change the face of this part of Ireland.

At first, all they made were washstands and tiles from earthenware, but eventually they had kilns hot enough to fire the treasured Parian from which porcelain is made. Birds and flowers, fish and bees were the decorative specialties.

The pieces were quite extravagant by the time Queen Victoria gave a dinner set to the German royal family in the late 19th century.

The Belleek pottery died and was reborn twice, in 1884 and 1920, but Michael Maguire's shamrock pattern survives to this day.

It's the most popular Belleek pattern in the world, and most of it is sold in the United States, where a nostalgic Irish population dreams of that faraway land and every American becomes Irish on St. Patrick's Day.

**YOU CAN TOUR** the pottery on any weekday. It would take 14 days to follow a piece from the master mold to its final firing, but you can see the process from beginning to end on the two-hour tour.

A working mold is used once a day for two weeks before the pattern begins to fade and the mold is destroyed. The wet clay, called "slip," is poured into the mold, left a moment or two, and poured out.

That thin layer, left to dry, is what

makes Belleek so translucent. The dried pieces go through the "fettling" process — the pattern is sharpened and the handles are added — and then it goes to the first firing, unless it must see the basketmakers and the flower-makers first.

It is fascinating to watch the famous Belleek baskets made with long strings of "spaghetti dough," and the ceramic petals formed one by one in a craftsman's hand.

Wherever you go in the pottery, you will see apprentices carrying long, flat trays of Belleek ware from one stage of the process to the next. They never seem to drop the china, and if they do, it is their master craftsman who pays the price, for he is paid by the finished piece.

Five percent of the Belleek made here is rejected (no, it is not sold in outlet stores), and the rest is quickly shipped around the world, leaving very little to buy in the town itself.

Collectors can join the Belleek Collectors Society, which gives them the opportunity to buy a limited edition piece once a year, as well as receiving a newsletter, catalog and other kinds of inside information of interest only to collectors.

**FOR MOST OF US**, the pottery, the village and the tourist possibilities in the surrounding area are of equal interest.

Belleek is at the western end of Lower Lough Erne, about 25 miles from the town of Enniskillen. The Lough attracts fishermen, nature lovers and historians, who are especially attracted to the medieval Christian ruins of Devenish Island.

You meet an occasional road patrol in rural Ireland, but little other sign of the Irish conflict is usually visible outside the cities. I was aware of The Troubles, as the Irish call it, when I saw high fences around hotels, and downtown areas converted to walking malls, but that was primarily in cities like Belfast and Londonderry. There is very little sign of it in the emerald green countryside that makes up most of this country.

If you follow Lower Lough Erne back to Belleek, you may see the island where the ruins of Castle Caldwell still stand. The entrance gate is a monument shaped like a bass fiddle, set up in 1770 "to the memory of Dennis McCabe, fiddler, who fell out of St. Patrick's barge, belonging to Sir James Caldwell, bart., and Count of Milan, and was drowned."

The party at which the fiddler was drowned would fill all our expectations of Ireland. Eighteenth century records show that the 120 tenants washed down their dinner with 19 gallons of rum, six gallons of whiskey and two barrels of ale.

Scratch an American traveler and you will often find a collector. Some people collect the creamy translucent dinnerware made by Belleek. Others get excited by small folksy figurines from Germany, called Hummels.

If you are a Hummel lover, visit Wally Bronner in Frankenmuth March 22-26 for Goebel Hummel Days, an annual event for collectors and experts who get together to feast their eyes and minds on their favorite form of decorative art.

Bronner is the founding owner of Bronner's Christmas Decorations, which started with a hand-painted sign in the basement of his father's home in Frankenmuth and now spreads across a one-acre showroom.

He carries 30,000 items in stock, including 3,000 kinds of Christmas tree decorations and hundreds of different nativity scenes, animated figures, and decorative figurines, especially Hummels.

Frankenmuth is known for its German heritage, so it should not surprise you that Bronner specializes in Hummels. In fact, he has one sample of every Hummel figurine being produced today, spread across the wall of his reception room in a glass display case.

During Hummel days, there will be film showings several times a day, German experts to discuss the Hummel figures with you and a chance to explore the collectors books where every Hummel is listed. This event is not for antique collectors; Bronner's does not display old figures, only those presently in production and for sale.

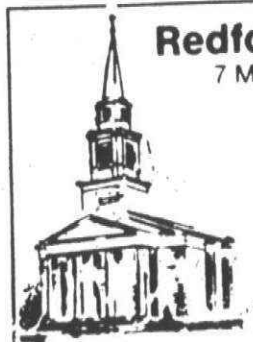

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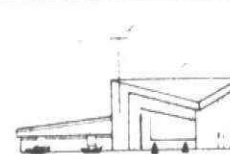
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# Guardian Angels (dolls, that is) are taking over

When they say Guardian Angel at the Methodist Children's Home in Redford, no one ever thinks of a motorcycle.

And members of the Methodist Children's Home Society never think of Guardian Angels in terms of street patrols.

For the last five years in these circles, Guardian Angels have been the donors of annual contributions to provide small extras for the children who live at the residential treatment center.

And now Guardian Angels have still another identity. They are gamin-faced dolls being crafted by women in United Methodist churches throughout the metropolitan area to raise more money for the Guardian Angel program.

BOTH THE program and the dolls are the brainchildren of Ann Burgess, who serves the village and the society as director of development.

In 1977, she started enlisting people to make special contributions for the youngsters, who are staying at the village because they are in need of particular kinds of help.

"The contributions mean they could have extra clothing, special treats, and things like hobby kits, books, games and musical instruments," Burgess said.

"By the end of last year we had 259 Guardian Angel subscribers, and each makes an annual donation of \$180."

Last year the society hosted a doll show and sale in the big administration building at Children's Village. That event started Ann Burgess thinking about dolls in connection with the Guardian Angel program.

Before she was through thinking, she had dreamed up a 14-inch pixie-like doll, complete with detachable halo and wings and a shirt emblazoned with the letters GA.

THE DREAM was translated into a sketch of a doll which Burgess copyrighted last July. Bill Beuchel of Communicative Graphics in Birmingham then found a dollmaker to turn the sketch into a doll. Kits with all the necessary pieces were worked out.

Thelma Baxter of St. Clair Shores

produced the first 10 prototype dolls. Now she and others assemble kits, and women in United Methodist churches as far away as Germfask in the Upper Peninsula and as close as Livonia, Redford, Farmington, Livonia and Birmingham are producing the dolls.

Grace Thorne of the First United Methodist Church of Birmingham has held several instructional workshops in her home, and she acts as troubleshooter for the makers, clarifying instructions and doing a bit of doctoring on some dolls that did not come out just right.

"They are not easy to make," Burgess said, and St. Matthew UMC members Sylvia Lindenberg, Loretta Marrs and Georgia Beckwith had to agree.

They all learned to do the assem-

bling in a workshop at their church, and they estimated it can take up to eight hours to complete a doll.

BUT THE PROJECT is netting some valuable dollars for the special children's fund.

Hard-pressed before Christmas to keep up with demand for the dolls, the project leaders now have a good supply on hand.

The dolls sell for \$25 and have so far traveled to Florida, Ohio, Ne Hampshire, Connecticut and Hawaii.

"We were thinking of them as presents for little girls," Burgess said, "but we're finding that college girls love them. Alfred H. Taylor, president of the Kresge Foundation, bought one for his office, but then his daughter went

back to college after Christmas, and he hasn't seen it since."

Burgess, who has tried stitching a doll, keeps close watch on the kits that go out, making sure that those who assemble them have good instruction.

She won't sell the kits because she insists on quality control, but she has noted that when completed the handmade dolls are just different enough to have their own "personalities."

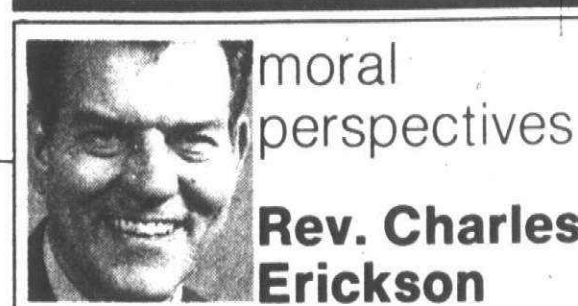

## Peacemakers should not be beggars

Conversations have been increasing about peace demonstrators at the site of nuclear weapons development and weapons locations. It is said that Montana, if it were to secede from the United States, would be the seventh most heavily armed nation in the world. There is increasing talk of holding back a portion of income tax to protest the defense budget.

A top nuclear scientist who advises the Reagan administration on weapons policy recently gave a persuasive speech. The heart of his analysis is that technology cannot be uninvited: We must learn to control nuclear weapons rather than suppose they can be eradicated.

A nationally prominent spokesman for resistance to nuclear weapons gave a companion speech. The center of his view is that we face the most serious moral crisis of all human history: Citizens must stop nuclear madness.

WHAT ARE WE ordinary people to do with conflicting wisdom from leaders? How can we deal

with the federal budget that is so lopsided in favor of armaments? Feelings are running high, and we need a calm that is other than playing ostrich.

Demonstrators seem to be begging for peace with an audience of people who merely carry out policy. Soldiers in Montana didn't decide to put nuclear weapons there. Tax resisters seem to be begging relief from people who have no voice in setting defense policy.

We need to assume decision makers want peace and find an effective method for influencing them. Begging is not the stance.

We are not slaves begging to have oppression lifted, no matter how oppressive taxes for defense seem. We are not feudal serfs begging for benevolence from cruel masters. We are in a democracy where citizens can control destiny.

Our elected representatives and senators have offices we can reach with a local phone call. They can be addressed in Washington for the price of a postage stamp. We have a civilian commander in chief. Our opinions are needed.

THE FIRST STEP is to shift from a posture of begging to a stance of acting as peace makers. We are acting on stage in this dramatic tragedy. Once we change from wishing for peace to making peace, we have the responsibility and freedom to act.

Peacemakers stop dividing people into partisans for issues and begin acting inclusively. We see things whole first in those close to us each day and then out to wider and wider involvements.

Yes, we are in a time of crisis. If we are sensitive and include in our thinking those suffering economic hardships, we will consider cutting defense spending. If we feel international tensions and include people in other lands as relatives, we will pursue peace with intensity.

Policy cannot be based on simplistic division into good guys and bad guys. As we seek peace, we must assume others do, too. We citizens can spur our leaders to risk change instead of risking destruction of the human race.



# Music department spotlighted

"Man does not live by voc-tech alone," a Schoolcraft College trustee used to say.

So Schoolcraft, best known for its culinary and vocational-technical programs, will put the spotlight on its music department as the college celebrates its 20th anniversary in northwestern Wayne County.

Graduates of Schoolcraft's traditional programs and the summer music school for high school students already have made major marks in the world, said Dr. Richard Saunders, assistant dean for fine arts.

IN THE DETROIT Symphony Orchestra, Corbin Wagner plays in the horn section and Debra Fayroian in the cello section, said Saunders.

Violinist Kirk Toth is a member of the Rochester Philharmonic, bassoonist Bruce Lupp is in the Berlin Philharmonic and Paul Randall is with the New Orleans Symphony.

Joan Malkiewicz and Diane Deiter teach music in the Detroit Public Schools. Others — such as saxophonist David Teal and singer Julia Broholm — perform professionally elsewhere.

"The University of Michigan School of Music considers us one of its two best feeder community colleges," said Saunders. His boast was confirmed by a U-M official, who said Grand Rapids was the other top community college for music.

Former Schoolcraft students have won major scholarships to universities in the U.S. and Germany.

FIVE PROGRAMS sponsored by Schoolcraft and one by the Plymouth Symphony will put the spotlight on the college, according to Middle Ellis, coordinator of special events in the office of community services.

All but the Plymouth performance will be in the Waterman Center, at the north end of the campus at 18600 Haggerty, Livonia. Dates and programs are:

• March 28, at 4 p.m. — a free recital by pre-college piano students. "We train students from the age of 6 through high school," said Donald Morelock, who heads the piano program and is an accomplished performer, too. "About 25 students are on the program, mostly with short pieces," he said. They play on a Steinway concert grand, purchased for the college by the Schoolcraft College Foundation.

• Also March 28, at 7 p.m. — a free honors recital by students of piano and orchestral instruments, plus the college's first accordion major.

• April 4, at 4 p.m. — the 10th annual piano honors recital, also free. These junior and senior high school performers were selected through a competition, Morelock said.

• April 14, 8 p.m. — a free concert by the 35-piece wind ensemble. "This is a group I started three years ago," said Saunders. "They are college students and persons in the community, hand-picked. There are music teachers, engineers, high school and college instructors, high school and college students from ages 16 to 60. They play symphonic band music, similar to what the Sousa band played."

(What's the difference between an ensemble and a band? In an ensemble, there is one player per part; in a band, multiple players per part.)

• April 8, 4 p.m. — the annual spring concert by the Schoolcraft Chorale (38 members) and madrigal singers (12). "They will perform the Mozart Mass in C-major and Daniel Pinkham's 'Wedding Cantata,'" said director Bradley Bloom, who selects the voices from music and liberal arts majors. Tickets

are \$1 for students, \$2 for others.

• April 25 at 4 p.m., the day after Schoolcraft's official celebration — the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra will give the premiere of "A Plymouth Symphony" by Robert W. Jones, the college's composer-in-residence. The Schoolcraft Community Choir, directed by Marilyn Jones, will sing vocal parts of both the Jones symphony and the Beethoven Mass in C-minor. It will be in the auditorium of Plymouth-Salem High School, on Joy west of Canton Center roads. General admission tickets are \$5, with prices halved for college students and senior citizens.

"WE HAVE 10 faculty, both full-time and part-time, and 35 music majors," said Saunders.

"Altogether about 300 persons of all ages are taking music courses of one kind or another at Schoolcraft."

"We have five performing ensembles with a total of 165 persons — three vocal groups and two instrumental."

"There are 45 courses within the music curriculum, giving concentrations in theory, ear-training, history, performance and teaching," he added. The teaching area is for the certification of pianists as piano teachers.

# Country spirit fills her songs

COUNTRY SINGER Lucy Ann Trierweiler is not a coal miner's daughter (her father picked cotton), but her life story is as appealing as the tale of Loretta Lynn.

Born in Union City, Tenn., Lucy Ann lived in the heart of the country until age 4. After her mother died, her father decided it was time to leave the cotton fields for a life in the suburban north.

So he made the long trek to Livonia, where he settled with his eight children and soon became an employee of General Motors.

That was 26 years ago, a memory as distant as the fields of Tennessee.

Like Loretta Lynn, Lucy Ann married at an early age (17). Unlike Loretta Lynn, however, Lucy Ann's husband was not very encouraging as far as her music was concerned.

"He told me I couldn't sing," she recalls.

IT IS SUCH advice that accounts for Lucy Ann's late start as a country singer. She is now 30 and has only been singing for three years. Her first opportunity to perform before an audience came as a total surprise.

"I was at a bar watching Jimmy Dunn and the Royal Flush," she said. "I wasn't expecting to sing. But Jimmy just called me up on stage. I was so scared my left leg was dancing."

Sometimes one has to push a child in the water to teach it how to swim. Lucy Ann had to be pushed into the limelight so she could be taught to perform.

"I think what really helped me get over the nervousness was singing at my dad's funeral last January," she said. "Before he died, he followed me everywhere I sang. He was so proud of me. Now, after singing for him, I'm not afraid to do anything."

She is now remarried, to Jerry Trierweiler, who is much more sympathetic to her talent than her first husband was. Jerry helps set up the equipment and also acts as her manager.

Her band is called Lucy Ann and the Country Lovers. And she goes by the stage name Lucy Ann True.

"THE BAND has been real supportive of me," she said. "At first, they didn't think a woman could carry them,

but I don't do everything myself. "There is no boss in the band. We're all like a family. We help each other out."

It is a humble attitude that accounts for the band sticking together. They have been together for three years and plan on going the rest of the way just as they are.

The band consists of Glen Terry on bass, Eddie Drago on drums, Don Erwin on steel guitar, Danny James on lead guitar and Danny James Jr. on rhythm and vocals. James Jr. is a temporary member, who will have a more permanent position in the future.

In three years, Lucy Ann and the Country Lovers have recorded three albums in Nashville. Their first album was "Better Off by Myself," followed by "Please Be My Love" and "Come Back to Me."

The last two are original recordings, each song written by various people. The music can be heard in jukeboxes throughout Plymouth.

"THE ONLY radio station in Michigan that gives us any airplay is WCXI," Lucy Ann said with disappointment. "We get more airplay in Kentucky on WFUL and out west."

"But the disc jockeys in Michigan haven't given us much support. Strangely enough, we had more airplay in Europe, where our music was played at grocery stores."

The band has not yet made it big-time. So it is sticking to the local scene, playing at bars and lounges.

In the past, it has been at the Wayne Moose, the Confetti Lounge in Dearborn, the Elks Club of Plymouth, and the Crossroads in Westland, which has reverted to a rock 'n' roll bar under the new name The Hobnob.

# Staples manages 2 concerts in a day

Only Detroit Symphony Orchestra's Concertmaster Gordon Staples would perform the "Thank You, Detroit" concert and the Tchaikovsky Violin Concerto in D Major in the same afternoon.

The "Thank You, Detroit" concert was held at the Fox Theatre at 5 p.m. Sunday. Earlier, at 3 p.m., Staples had soloed with the Oakway Symphony Orchestra at Southfield-Lathrup High School, playing one of the difficult works in violin literature, the Tchaikovsky concerto.

Even Leopold Auer, for whom the concerto was first dedicated by the composer in 1878, and from whom Staples' musical heritage descends, refused to play the work, calling it "too difficult and radical to play."

Staples' tempo for this rendition was brisk, playing the work's many arpeggios, double stops, pizzicatos and cadenzas with a style that never loses its melodic qualities. Despite the rapidity and technical complexity, Staples' notes were clearly defined.

THE CONCERTO opens with a simplistically deceptive lyrical melody in the orchestra followed by a melodic opening by Staples.

One would only expect such lyrical Russian qualities from Tchaikovsky. From that point, it is as if the composer deliberately set out to create a work requiring the greatest dexterity that the musical form could allow.

Staples received an ovation after the first movement but later the artist did not give the audience any such opportunity as he did not take any break between the second and third movements.

The "Andante" or the second movement was the familiar nostalgic tune offering a calm reprieve for the violinist. But the action quickly moves back into the virtuoso qualities that mark the number.

In the midst of this technical entanglement springs forth the gentle Russian charm and appeal so well handled by Staples.

In his hands, Staples kept the tonal qualities that separated this performance from one of mere acrobatics. And, his "Salabue" violin, built long before the concerto was ever conceived, was never beaten in the process.

STAPLES SO captivated his audience and the orchestra members that during his cadenza in the first movement all eyes were focused on him, and only with reluctance it seemed the orchestra members picked up their instruments to continue the concerto.

The concert was opened by Conductor Francesco Di Blasi and the orchestra with "Der Freischutz" by Weber, and the concerto was fittingly followed by Schubert's "Unfinished" Symphony and a relatively new work from Ginastera, "Prelude to the Creole Faust."

The Weber provided the listeners with a spirited expectation of what was to follow, expectations that were not disappointed. Though Americans have little opportunity to see the entire German opera, this

overture is a popular symphonic program selection.

The Symphony No. 8 in B Minor by Schubert is referred to as "unfinished" as it contains only two movements with no hint from the composer on the original manuscripts of an impending third and fourth. Did the composer lose interest in the work and never finish it or is the work finished in the composer's mind?

Whatever Schubert's intentions, he sent the manuscript to Anselm Huttenbrenner, a composer of the day. Not until 1865, 43 years after it was composed, was the symphony ever heard, as Huttenbrenner could not be persuaded to give up his treasure.

Concluding the concert, Di Blasi chose an interesting South American contemporary work which takes off on the theme from Gounod's "Faust."

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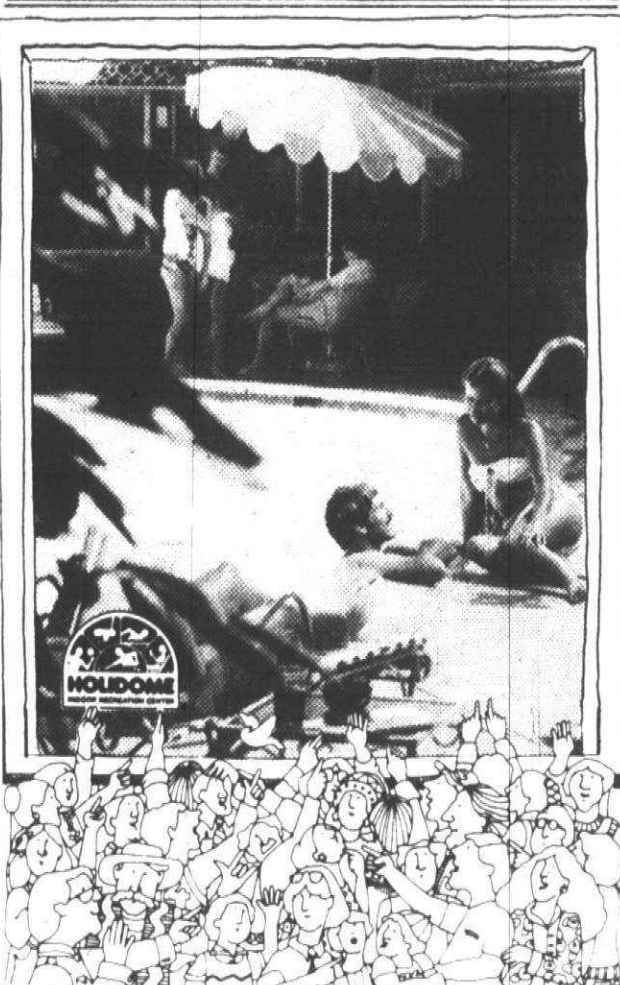
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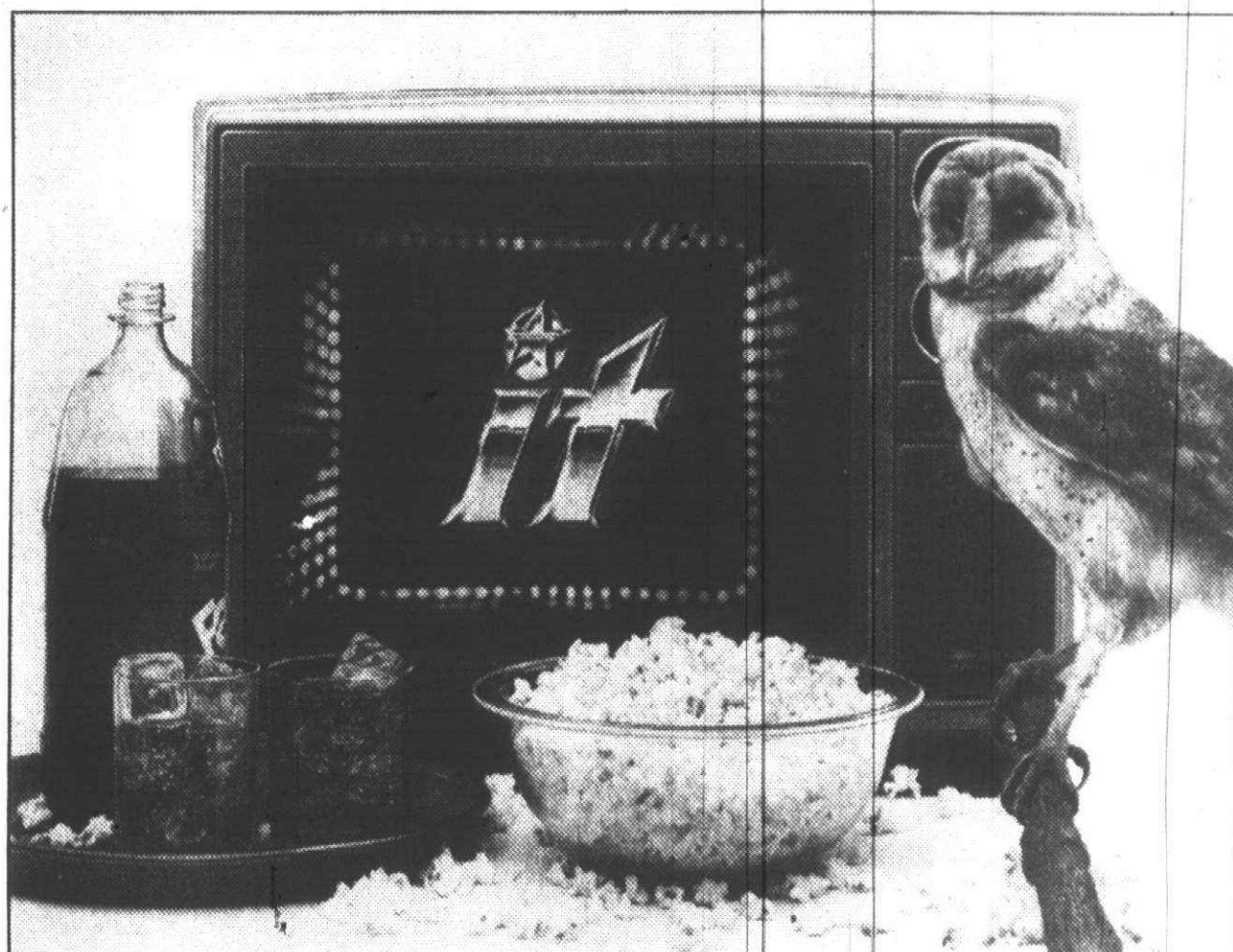
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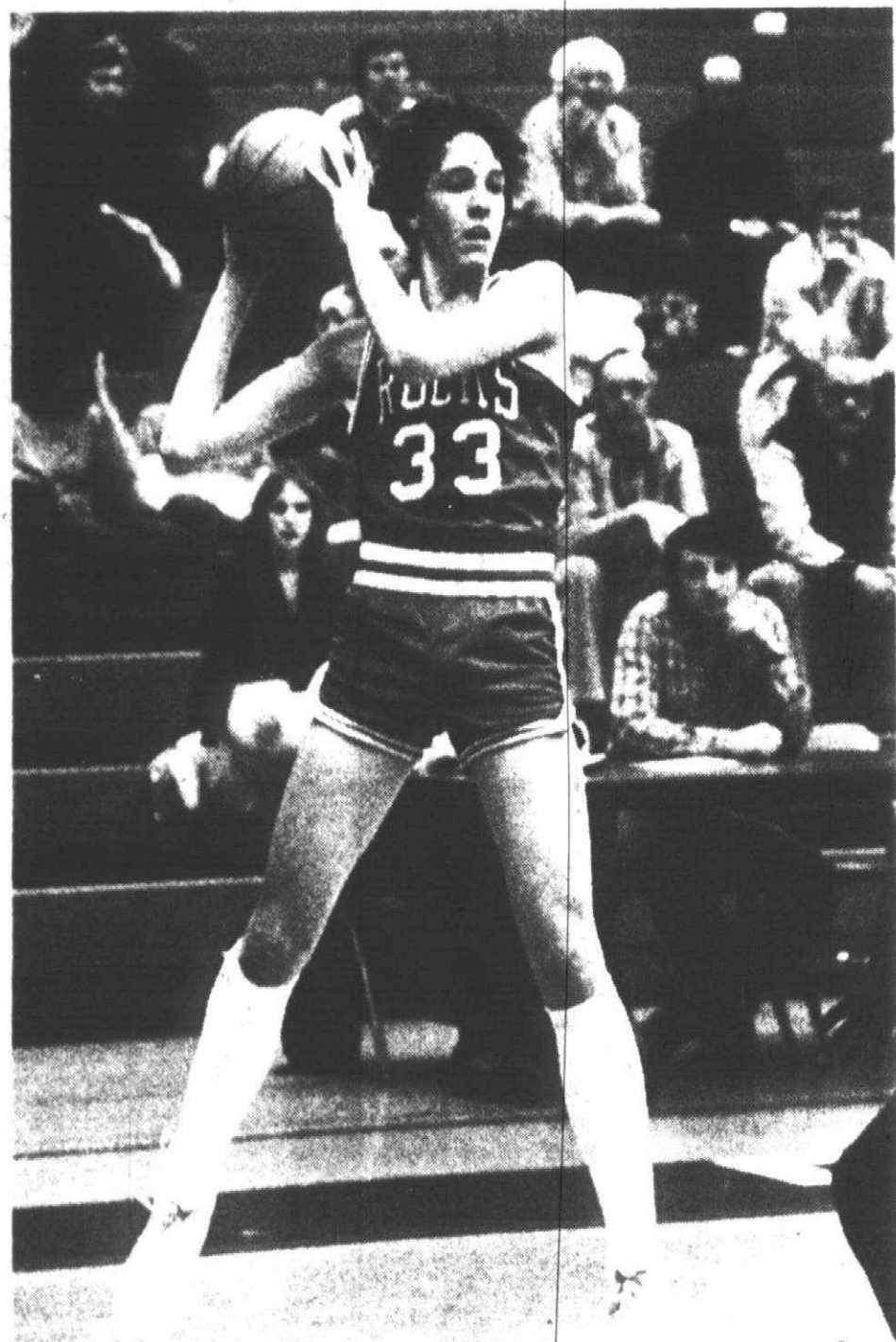

## Hoop deliberation

### Salem faces stiff test in Ypsi regional

Order in the court! It's a night of judgment for the Plymouth Salem basketball team.

The Rocks will find out how far they've progressed this season as they take on Detroit Southwestern and "the Judge," Antoine Joubert, in the first round of the regional tonight at Ypsilanti. Game time is 7:30. The winner advances to the championship game at 7:30 p.m. Saturday.

Salem, which sports a 20-3 record, won its district title at Canton last week with ease. Southwestern (19-3), meanwhile, is a solid contender to win the state championship after beating Birmingham Brother Rice two weeks ago for the Detroit Public-Catholic League championship.

Joubert, a 6-foot-6 junior, is simply the most talked about high school cager to perform in Michigan since Earvin "Magic" Johnson.

He scored a career-high 48 points in Saturday's 78-59 romp over Wyandotte.

"Twoon," as his teammates call him, excels at all phases of the game. He's a deadly shooter from long range, rebounds and hits the open man.

"It's a one-man team that makes the other players play good," said Salem coach Fred Thomann. "They look for his leadership."

"He's a great one and only time will tell."

THE PROSPECTORS are a full-court pressing team led by guards Jamie Davis and Brian Arnold.

"They'll come hard with pressure the whole night," said Thomann. "If we can't get the ball across the time line,

then there will be no game. They're quicker than any team we've played."

Coach Perry Watson of Southwestern varies his starting lineup. Senior Allen Nichols came off the bench and drilled in 28 points when Joubert was double-teamed in the Prospectors' PSL title win against North Western.

Juniors Keith Bates and Eddie Benavides, sophomore Clarence Jones and freshman Sam Sillmon split the rest of the playing time.

"There's been steady improvement," said Watson. "We're executing the fundamentals. We're eliminating the steps and offensive fouls."

Salem will try make it a half-court game, opting for patience on offense. Southwestern will counter that with a running game.

"FIRST OF ALL," said Watson. "Plymouth Salem is well coached. They're strong and physical. They rebound well and are sound fundamentally. They're one of the top defensive

teams in the area and that's a tribute to Fred."

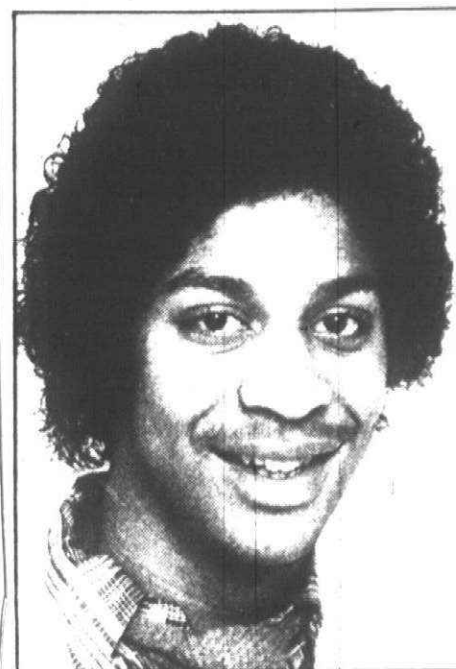
The two teams met in a scrimmage at Oakland Community College over the holidays. They've also scrimmaged against each other during the summer.

"We've known each other," explained Watson, "but they're not the same team as they were two months ago, or seven months ago. But, neither are we for that matter."

"Southwestern has come together at the end of the season," said Thomann. "I really think they're a fine basketball team."

Salem will have the size advantage with a starting lineup that includes a pair of 6-3 guards, David Miller and Mike McBride, 6-1 junior Glen Medalle and 6-5 sophomore Rick Berberet at the forwards, and 6-8 senior Norm Haygood at center.

Dave Houle, a 6-3 junior, doesn't start, but has led Salem in scoring the last three games. Others who will probably see playing time tonight are John Cohen, John Kelliher and Scott Bublin.

## Canton hosts top gymnasts

Girls' gymnastics will hit the big time this weekend at Plymouth Canton High School.

Canton and coach John Cunningham will host the state finals for the first time on Friday and Saturday at the Phase III gym.

"I think it really is an honor for Canton to do it," said Cunningham. "I hope Canton is represented well. The facilities and equipment will be good, and it should be an enjoyable meet to watch."

The event will run over a two-day period under new format, kicking off at 6 p.m. Friday. Eight teams will be vying for the team title that evening — Ann Arbor Huron and Pioneer, Troy, Birmingham Seaholm, Grand Blanc, Ludington, East Kentwood and Holt. Those teams qualified by finishing first or second at four different regional sites last weekend.

Individual competition also will be held Friday. Gymnasts will vie in four individual events (vault, uneven bars, balance beam and floor ex-

ercise). The meet will continue at 1 p.m. Saturday.

The qualifiers will combine their scores from both days to determine the finish in each event, including 24 girls who will be shooting for all-around honors.

TICKETS will be sold at the door for \$2 each day.

"No one wanted to hold the state meet because it's running two days this year," said Cunningham, the meet director. "I said (to the MHSAA) that Canton had good facilities, and that it wouldn't be a problem for us to hold it for two days."

"It should be good on Saturday because this will allow the people to watch gymnastics that has people who are really exceptional in each event."

Last year's one-day meet at Troy High School drew 1,500 fans, 300 more than the gym's seating capacity. Canton's gym holds 1,250, but the meet will run two days.

"Some people who show up on Friday night might not come on Saturday if they don't qualify for the finals," said Cunningham. "There

also might be a lot of people who just want to come on Saturday to see the top 10 girls in each event."

Cunningham, whose lone representative is Laura Michalik on vault, is looking for a good area turnout.

"I'D LIKE to see a lot of people from the community come out to the meet," said Cunningham. "The people from our area usually don't get to see gymnasts that perform this well."

East Kentwood's Jodi Thompson, the all-around winner at the Muskegon Mona Shores regional last week, should be the meet's standout. Only a junior, Thompson is already a two-time defending all-around state champ.

Other girls who will likely challenge Thompson for top honors include DeAnn Dalrymple of Holt, a winner at the East Lansing region. Sharon McNie of Royal Oak Kimball, the Troy region champ, and Adrian region winner Bridget Boyer of Jackson Lumen Christi.

## Michalik vaults in state meet

Laura Michalik, a Plymouth Canton senior, has qualified for Friday's state gymnastics meet in the vault after an eighth-place finish at the Adrian regional meet last weekend.

She posted a score of 8.45 to earn a spot in Friday's competition, which incidentally will be held at Canton. Competition begins at 6 p.m. The individual finals are set for 1 p.m. Saturday, also at Canton. Admission each day is \$2.

As a team, Canton finished 10th. Ann Arbor Pioneer and Huron finished one-two respectively at Adrian to earn a

berth in Friday's team competition. Regional results appear on page 4C.

Last season, Michalik qualified for all-around competition in the state meet thanks to a second-place showing at the Huron regional. She went on to finish 20th overall and 16th in vault.

Last Saturday, Michalik was 14th overall in all-around with a total of 31.20 points. (The top six from each region qualify for the state meet).

Michalik was hampered at Adrian by a bruised thigh suffered in a league meet two weeks ago.

"LAURA'S injury made it difficult for her to work well in every event," said Canton coach John Cunningham.

"But she's just about overcome it. There's a little swelling on her thigh, but she should be at full strength on Friday."

"The vault is Laura's best event, and she should do well. I know there are a number of girls in the state that Laura can't beat, but she might qualify for the top 10. She has the potential and just might do it."

## Let's review policy on officiating

From the first high-school basketball game in December until the season finale in March, the officials on the court continually are under scrutiny from players, coaches and fans.

Now, with March Madness at a peak, the referees more than ever are viewed with much more intensity. You see, when the state tournament rolls around, a team is one loss away from completing its season. So when an official makes a call which does not favor the home team, he can expect to catch an exorbitant amount of negative feedback.

During the past eight days, I have viewed six high-school tournament games, and in each, the officials were on the receiving end of hard knocks. Many of the criticisms were well justified, yet just as many could be labeled sour grapes.

The reason for the outcry is pure and simple — the tournament stirs emotions. And when things are not going as you like, you look for a scapegoat to vent your frustrations. The guys in the black and white jerseys are the scapegoats.

EXAMINING THE official situation is a touchy subject. There's no simple solution to remedy the problem of "poor officiating." Like the players, the officials make mistakes. But, unlike the players, the officials are being paid for participating in the game.

My first observation about officials is their appearance. The game has passed many of them by. I've seen too many gray-haired, obese officials who just can't keep up with the fast-paced game of basketball. I don't see how overaged, overweight officials can

keep up with a bunch of well-conditioned teen-agers.

In order to make the right calls, the official has to be in the right spot at the right time. When you're not able to keep pace with the youngsters, you're not going to be in position.

My second observation deals with consistency. Too many games have been called close for one half, and tight in the second. The officials can control the tempo of a basketball game, and the players have to adjust. And it's impossible to do when the referees change by calling a different type of game in the second half.

From my discussions with refs, a foul should be called when a player takes unfair advantage of an opposing player. A touch is not an unfair advantage, yet time and time again, you see a foul called when that occurs.

I TALKED with one official who said, "I know basketball is not a strict non-contact sport. The question — in calling a foul — is, 'Did the player take advantage of another?' That's the key."

Another official added, "A touch is not an advantage. I try to let the kids play basketball. I think the kids ought to be able to play. The game of basketball is not a free-throw contest. On the other hand, if there is a foul, I'll call it."

It's not very difficult to become a registered official with the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA). Fred Sible, an assistant director for the MHSAA, outlined the procedure.

"First-year registration consists of taking an open-book test on the mechanics of the game," he said. "Our feeling is if they know the mechanics, they'll be in the right place to make the right calls."

The next step, after passing the test (scoring at least 70 percent), the potential officials are sent a rulebook and a registration form. After sending in the required registration fee and receiving your registered official patch, the candidate is certified. Just like that. And that's official.

FROM THERE, officials — since they are independent contractors — must solicit their own games. According to Sible, officials usually start at the junior-high-school level and work their way to the high-school scene.

Each year, an official must have at least 16 ratings from coaches who had the referee work their game.

"We ask the coaches to wait 24 hours before filling out the rating," Sible chuckled.

Since getting games is the ultimate goal of an official, can you see a problem with performance? Athletic directors have the responsibility of getting officials for games. If a referee has a history of calling "bad games" at Podunk High, you can bet the A.D. won't have him back. But if a coach at Podunk happens to favor a particular official because he makes calls favorable to Podunk, you know he'll be on the court again.

Then you have a "homer" official. Although there may be flaws in the system, Sible said he believes the method is sufficient.

"I DON'T think there are any flaws in the method," he said. "Like any vocation, you have to start somewhere. You have to practice to become good at what you're doing. You have to repeat, repeat, and repeat to become a good official. A lot has to do with their (officials') temperament. Some of them can't stand the yelling, but they have to realize they're not yelling at you, they're yelling at the shirt."

I can't lay the blame of questionable officiating on the officials alone. I can't believe they deliberately try to give one team an advantage. They are out there trying to do the best possible job.

Basketball may be the toughest game to officiate because it is so instantaneous. It's difficult in the aspect that the time period given to interpret the rules is at a minimum. You have to make the call immediately. But I believe there should be more of a testing ground for officials. After all, athletes have to make the grade to play high-school sports, shouldn't the officials?

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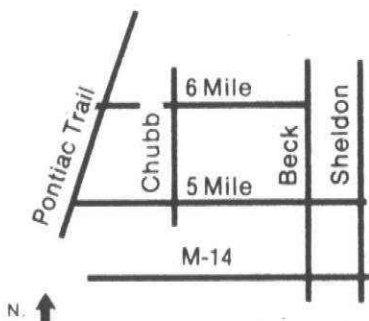
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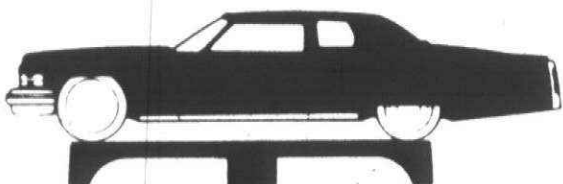
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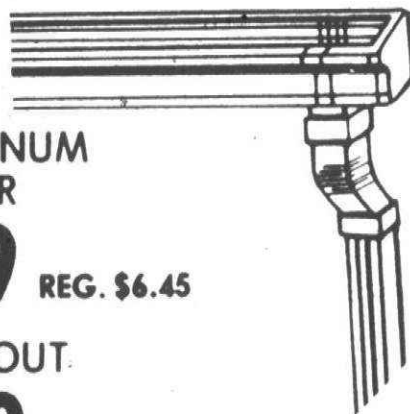
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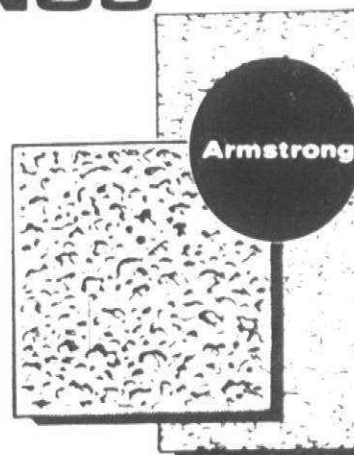
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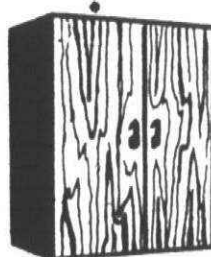
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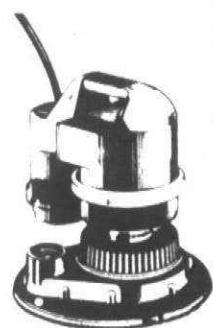
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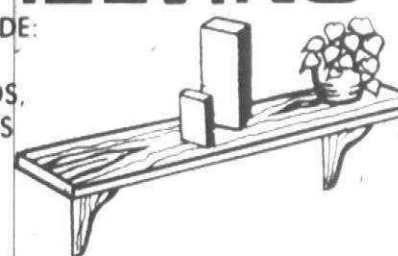
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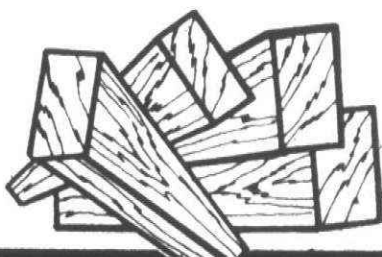
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# Borgess ousts basketball coach

The Catholic League is competitive. And when the competition is fierce, a coach's job is that much more difficult. Bill Croteau knew that, too.

It didn't help. Croteau is out of a job as Redford Bishop Borgess' basketball coach.

He was fired Monday as the Spartans' coach by Borgess athletic director Ralph Owen.

"Bill Croteau is a fine man, but we wanted to give someone else a chance," Owen said. "It's not that we were dissatisfied. It's just that we want to see if someone else can't get the program turned around."

Borgess had shown improvement in the last three years, although it was slight. The Spartans were 6-14 in Croteau's first season (1979-80) and 7-13 a year ago. This season, they compiled an 8-13 record, but managed just one win in 10 Catholic League Central Division games.

"EVERYTHING'S BEEN kind of promising," Croteau said, acknowledging that the move caught him by surprise. "Considering our league, we thought we were headed in the right direction. Everything was on its way up. But the win factor is the most important factor. I guess this is part of the life you lead in coaching."

Although Borgess' record in league play was poor, the Spartans were a young team among veterans. The other five league teams all won district titles with mostly senior teams.

Borgess loses three seniors to graduation but has a strong contingent returning, including leading scorer and rebounder Lewis Scott.

"Whoever gets the job will inherit some really good kids."

Apparently, Croteau's rebuilding job wasn't going fast enough. When he was hired, it wasn't the first time Croteau was assigned the task of reconstructing a basketball program.

"When I went into Thurston, it was at the bottom of the barrel. Now Thurston's doing real well."

"When I came here and we won six games, Ralph (Owen) told me at the end of the season, 'I didn't think you'd win any'."

"In the Catholic League, the toughest thing is watching the CYO (Catholic Youth Organization) leagues and then persuading the parents to send their kids to the school you're at."

Croteau, who teaches at Fisher Elementary in the South Redford School District, has not given consideration to coaching in the future.

"I just don't believe its all winning and losing," he said.

"I believe in the kids. It's frustrating because I'm disappointed in the turn of events."

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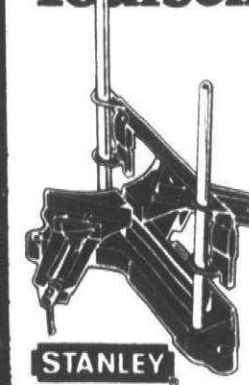


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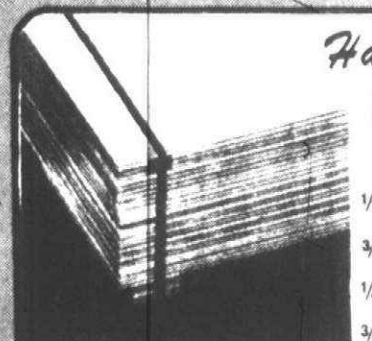


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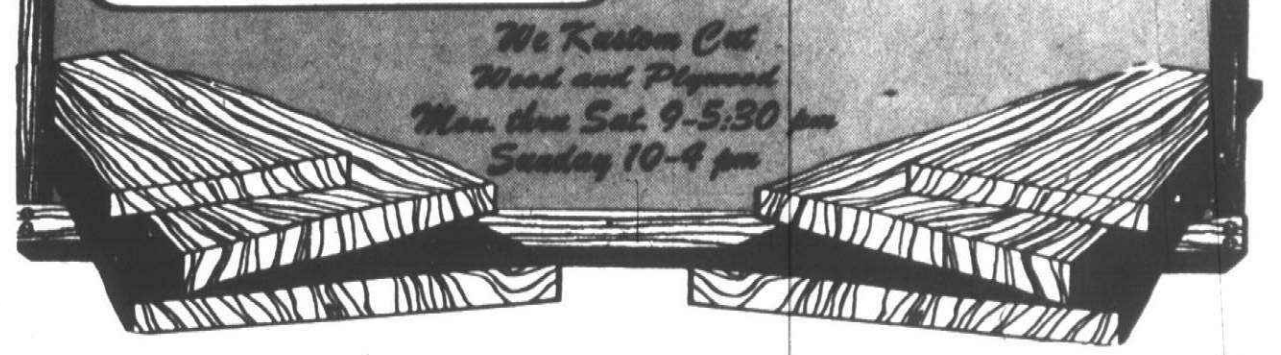

## Keep your friendly opponent cornered

The analogy may be a bit unusual, but think about it for a minute. Real estate executives always target specific land areas which they believe will help them achieve monetary goals.

The same can be said about racquetball, where targeting certain areas of court "real estate" has proved to be rewarding.

What court areas am I talking about? The "high-yield" back corners, of course. As a control power player, I use the back corners frequently to frustrate my opponents, so there's no reason you can't "cash in" on this bonanza, too.

Think of the back corners as commercial rather than residential property. You don't want to live there. You just want to control the land.

TO ME, maintaining back-corner control means keeping control of center court, that seven-foot square behind the short line.

What you DO NOT want to do is let the ball pass through your center-court position, because it may force you to give up center court and put you, instead of your opponent, on the defensive.

Instead, create in your mind two small cubes which sit invisibly in each back corner. The cubes should be three-feet high, three-feet wide and three-feet deep.

To control these corners, you should strive to hit your shots through these cubes. It doesn't matter how — just as long as the ball, at some point during a rally, moves in an out of that cube.

Obviously, unless you're a glutton for punishment, you want to play to your opponent's weakness — either the back left or right corner (forehand or backhand).

DON'T OVERUSE the strategy, though, because you want the element of surprise on your side. Keep them guessing.

What type back-corner shots you use will invariably depend on if you're serving, your opponent's court position, your strength and quickness, the tempo and the score of the game.

Basically, down-the-line drive serves, hard and soft Z-serves and even lob serves will fulfill the purpose of putting your opponent's back to the wall. Cross-courts, drives, pass-

es — pretty much the whole racquetball repertoire — in turn will keep your opponent panted to the corners while a point is in progress.

With the area so tight and the angles acute, a mixture of shots which force a player to move his feet for a quick set-up, make him shoot on the run or get boxed in a corner will prove effective.

But what happens when the roles are reversed? What happens when you're the person being painted into a corner?

THE KEY WORD in this situation is TIME. You want to buy yourself some. Unless you're set up or have a clear picture of your next shot (or just want to get the game over quickly), don't make any foolish attempts at kills or cross-court pinches from 38 feet away.

Go to the ceiling. Use the ceiling shot to get yourself back in position, to prolong the point and to allow you time to recover.

Other shots — the high pass, around-the-wall ball, even an occasional down-the-line drive — may prove effective, but again, a lot depends on how close that corner is and your body/ball position.

Many professional players use the back corners effectively. I use them more than most. Recently, however, I played my Ektelon teammate John Eggerman in the finals of a tournament in Michigan.

John drove his wall shots as well as I've ever seen him, putting me into the dreaded positions I've explained in this article. But I countered with ceiling shots, played a bit of a waiting game, and was finally able to defeat John to win the tournament.

Fortunately, even after a summer without too many tournaments, I retained the quickness necessary to retrieve John's shots and eventually turned them into some points for myself. I hope, with some practice, that my tips will prove just as productive for you.

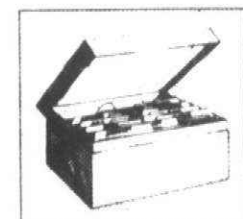

The former Eastern Michigan golf great is staying with brothers Tom, Ray and Joe in Ft. Lauderdale awaiting the next pro stop: the Greater Greensboro Open in North Carolina in two weeks.

His current best pro outing was earlier this season at the Hawaiian Open. He tied for 22nd and earned \$2,854. Proben was also among the early leaders at the Bob Hope Desert Classic before missing the cut.

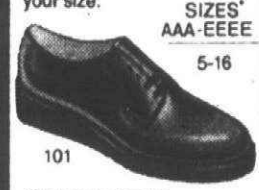
At present, he has one goal: "Make the top 125 (on the money list) to keep my tour card."

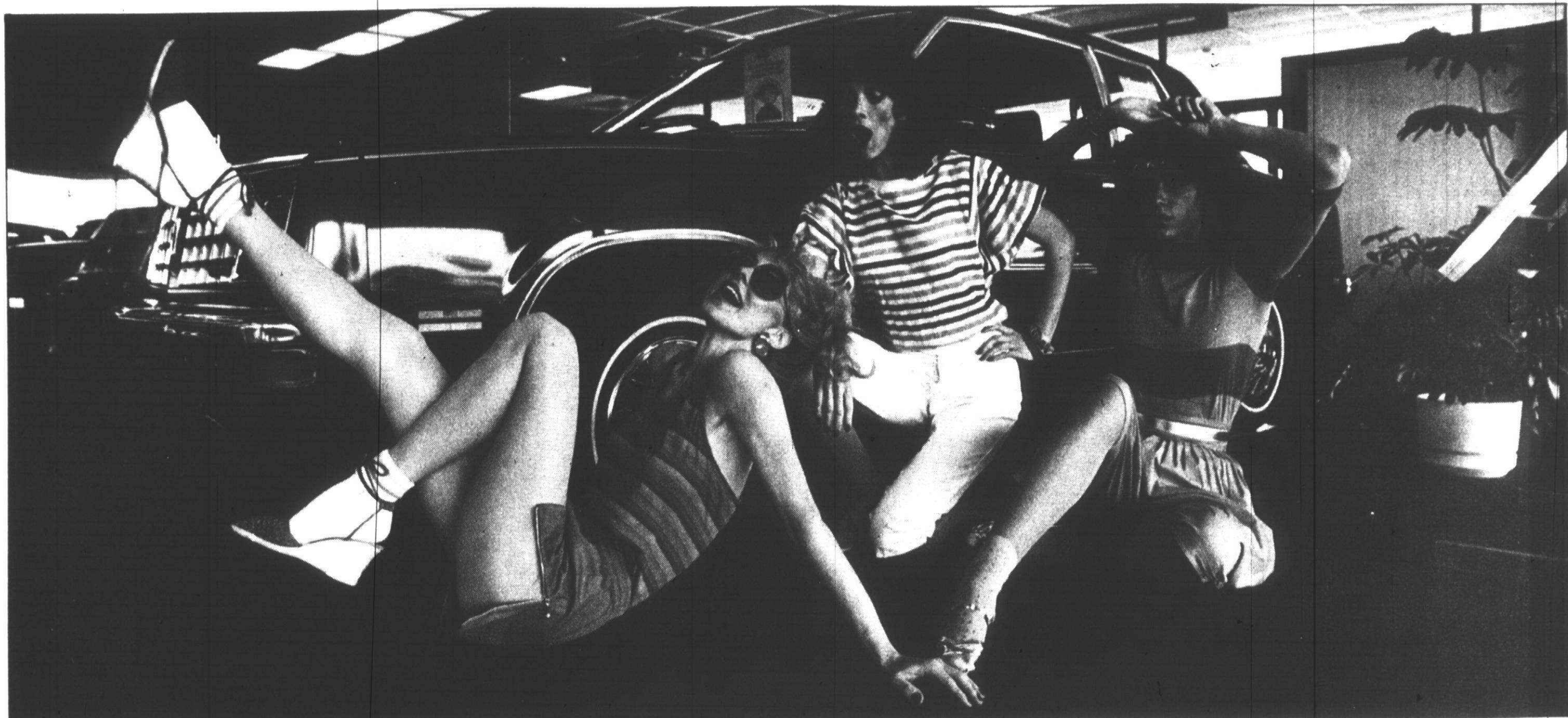
Patterns are paired, combining stripes and dots.

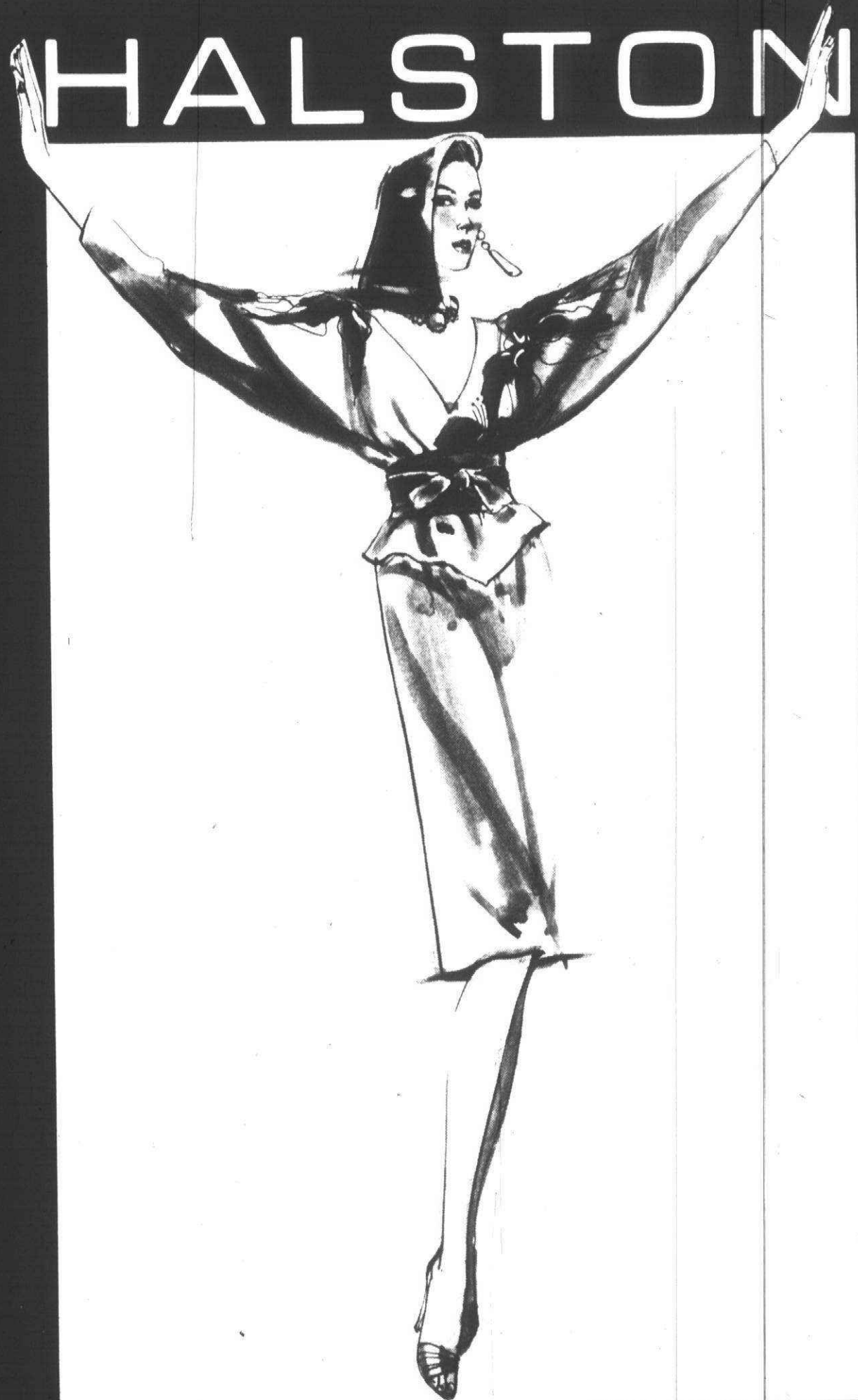

The rustic or prairie style is found in natural, black, faded denim, with red and turquoise accent colors. The prints are linear and geometric.

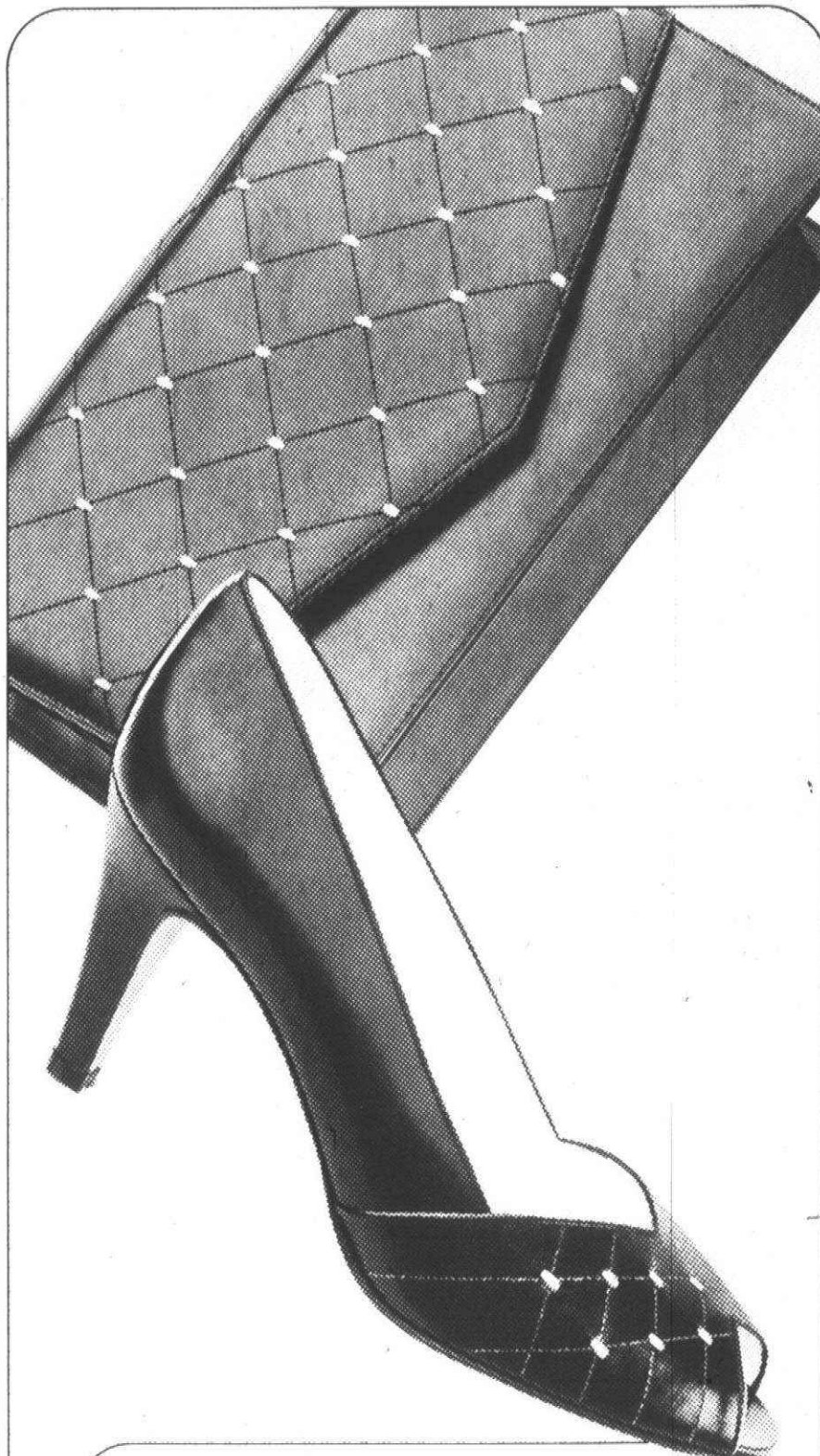
