**YOU'RE NOT GOING** to believe it. Plymouth-Canton Community Schools will send a musical group to perform in the second annual Canton Country Festival parade in August. No, it won't be the famed Centennial Educational Park marching band, which the parade committee requested. Instead, band boosters have organized to sponsor a summer session for the percussion section and color guard, said board president Carol Davis.

Fifty students in this group will be available to perform in the Canton parade, much to the delight of the parade committee. The marching band will not be available because school is not in session, Davis said in a letter to Jim Gillig, chairman of the committee.

**CARL LEVIN**, D-Michigan, will have two members of his U.S. Senate staff present for a meeting from 3-5 p.m. Thursday, June 24, at Canton's Township Hall, on Canton Center south of Cherry Hill. **JAMES POOLE**, Canton's supervisor, will be the umpire of a student-faculty softball game at 1:15 p.m. tomorrow at Walker Elementary School. Before the game, Poole will present a certificate to Eric Linsley, 8, in recognition of his saving a baby from a fire in late April.

**BOB HUBER**, senatorial candidate, will speak to the Canton Republican Club at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, June 24, at Canton Township Fire Hall No. 1, on the corner of Cherry Hill and Canton Center. Everyone is welcome to attend. For more information on the meeting, call president David M. Morse at 455-5217.

**ERNE HARWELL**, Hall-of-Fame broadcaster for the Detroit Tigers, will be the honored speaker at the Camp Fire Detroit Area Council fund-raising luncheon on Friday at the Fairlane Manor in Dearborn. For more information, call 833-2670.

**MARIE SMITH** of Canton was one of seven Wayne County residents recently honored for more than 25 years of volunteer service to the American Red Cross, Southeastern Michigan chapter. She also is a charter member of the Annapolis Hospital Auxiliary.

## 10 candidates vie for 2 board seats

Before the night is over, there will be two winners and eight losers.

Residents today are voting to elect two members for four-year terms on the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

With 10 candidates on the ballot, voters will choose two winners.

### Election night newslines ready

The Observer Election Hotline is ready to provide election results tonight to residents.

Readers may learn the winners of today's Plymouth-Canton Board of Education election by calling 459-2700.

The Observer news staff expects to be able to report trends about 9 p.m. and will report the names of the winners as soon as the unofficial vote totals are received.

The election hotline will remain open until midnight tonight.

Callers will be told the names of leaders or winners only, and where other candidates placed. Specific vote totals or precinct voting results cannot be given out over the phone because of the large number of calls received.

Such information about the election may be found in the news columns of Thursday's Observer.

At least one new member will be elected to the school board, as president Carol Davis of Plymouth is not seeking re-election.

The only incumbent on the ballot is Elaine Kirchgatter of Canton.

Candidates Marilyn Rickard and Ernest Rumsby, both of Canton, were defeated in the June the school board election and are running again.

**E.J. MCCLENDON** of Plymouth Township had served on the school board four years, including service as president, and is seeking a four-year term today.

The other hopefuls are Lynn Hoehn of Plymouth, Roland Thomas Jr. of Plymouth, Arthur Leib of Canton, Janis Draper of Canton, David Artley of Canton and Rodney Hosman of Plymouth.

Hoehn, active in school affairs and a regular attendee of board meetings, is a former school teacher. Thomas, also active in school affairs, is a Plymouth High graduate. He works for Ford Motor Co.

Artley, a businessman, has attended many board meetings during the past year and is on school district committees.

**MCCLENDON** is a professor of public health for University of Michigan. In addition to his activities in the school district, he has served on committees for Plymouth Township government.

Hosman is a junior high school principal for Van Buren Public Schools. Before that, he worked for Ford Motor Co. and General Motors.

Rickard, a regular board attendee, has served on numerous school committees. He is a former school teacher.

Besides school activities, Hoehn has been involved in the Plymouth Family YMCA.

Leib has experience in finance and budgeting as a Ford Motor Co. employee and has a master's degree in educational administration.

Draper, a former home economics teacher, has been involved in church and community affairs.

**KIRCHGATTER** has been active in the Plymouth Community Arts Council, Plymouth branch of the American Association of University Women, Plymouth Symphony Society and Symphony League, and Plymouth Historical Society.

Rumsby is a regular board attendee. He is involved with the local American Legion, Plymouth Jaycees, Canton Police, and with Friends of the Library in Canton and Plymouth.

School board members who don't need to run for election today are Tom Yack of Canton, Flossie Tonda of Canton, Sylvia Stetz of Plymouth, Glenn Schroeder of Plymouth and William Decker of Plymouth. Yack is the senior member and Decker the junior member on the board.

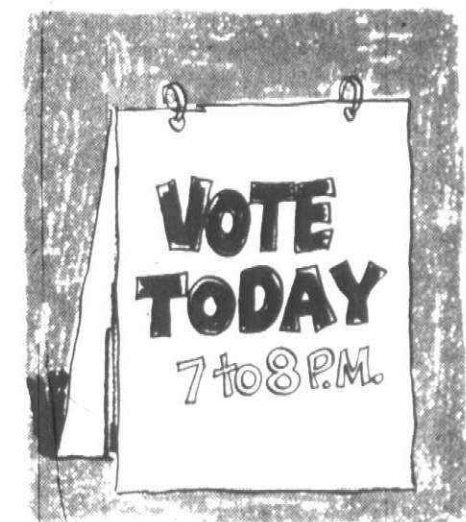
The polls will close at 8 p.m. today. Anyone standing in line at that time will be allowed to vote.

Some of the issues that may be on the minds of voters today include finances and budget cuts, safety, busing, discipline in the schools and at home, academic performance and ac-

countability, open decision-making and information sharing between board and public, the implications of declining enrollment, and wage levels of school employees.



## Poole seeks ideas from cities, towns on public safety

The controversial police-fire consolidation issue promises to heat up in another month or so.

Township Supervisor James Poole polled 75 communities throughout the country that have knowledge of merging police and firefighting services.

Poole, who is compiling the results, plans to bring the consolidation issue before the Township Board in July. He also hopes to schedule a presentation by an impartial expert on consolidation.

A sampling of those replies indicates that some communities have successfully trained their police officers and firefighters to perform both functions.

However, the idea has failed in other communities, primarily because of political issues or resistance from employees.

"Where people didn't want it to work, it didn't," said Poole. "The failures are as important as the successes, because of the information you can glean from them."

**AT ISSUE** is whether it would be feasible for Canton police and firefighters to be trained to handle police and firefighting duties, becoming "public safety officers."

Township board members decided they needed more information to make a decision. A public hearing was held March 31.

Supervisor Poole believes consolidation will put more officers on the street for patrol work and make maximum use of employees' time.

"It isn't a question of saving money," said Poole. "The key issue is the maximum utilization of the people who are working."

Firefighters contend consolidation would result in eventual layoffs or early retirements. They also are concerned about costs and inadequacies of cross-training, and the effect on residents' safety under the plan.

The police officers' union hasn't announced an official position.

**CURRENTLY ON HAND** are a report by Glenford Leonard, public safety director for Oak Park, which says cross-training is feasible in Canton. The report was prepared at a cost of \$8,000.

A plan would be phased in over two years, Leonard said. Volunteers would provide backup.

Opposing that view is David McCormack, a former superintendent of a national fire academy and a former firefighter. He is a fire protection consultant and is on retainer to the national firefighters' association.

"It is simply too much to expect any single individual to perform both tasks in the same job description at the same time," said McCormack, in his 125-page report.

**MEANWHILE**, A sampling of the replies already received from Poole indicates public-safety is working well in many communities, including several small cities in Michigan.

Successful plans are in operation in Farmington (11,000 population), Escanaba (15,000), Grosse Pointe Woods (19,000) and Oak Park (37,000). Blackman Township, near Jackson, includes the Southern Michigan Prison in Jackson.

Consolidation failed in other communities.

Manhattan Beach, Calif., scrapped a consolidation proposal because of "extensive lobbying by unions of the police and fire departments," said David J. Thompson, city manager. He suggested that Canton abandon the idea unless the township "is in dire economic difficulties."

**DANVILLE, VA.**, abandoned its consolidated department because of conflicts in priorities when crimes and fires occurred simultaneously, as well as unhappiness among employees, said T. Neal Morris, police chief.

Public safety became a "political football" in other communities, according to the replies.

Several officials recommended that any consolidation plan be approached slowly and carefully.

## Canton man flexes muscles

Gary Goss of Canton builds his dreams on large, rippling arm muscles and a powerhouse chest.

Goss, 26, has spent nine years working, sweating and sacrificing to build a body that wins contests and draws stares on the street.

Currently, he works as a bouncer in a Belleville bar. Someday, he hopes to earn money as a professional body-builder.

Last month, Goss topped 21 other contestants vying for the title of Mr. Michigan during a body-building contest at a fitness fair at the Eight Mile Armory in Detroit. His title wins him a trip to New York in August for the Mr. America competition.

Goss, who competes under the auspices of the Amateur Athletic Association (no pay), has won 15 other state body-building competitions and has about 100 trophies from various contests.

"I'VE BEEN doing it so long (body-building), it's like a job," said Goss. "It depends on will power, diet and training."

Goss is an imposing presence with his blue eyes, blond hair and burly build.

He's 5-feet-10 inches tall and weighs 215 pounds. His chest measures 53 inches, waist 31 inches, and biceps 19½ inches. His thigh measures 28½ inches, and his calf is 18½ inches, said Goss.

Goss, a 1973 graduate of Plymouth Salem High School, began lifting weights and building his body when he was 17. He increased the time spent working out in gyms and began entering contests.

Currently, Goss works out two or three hours a day, seven days a week. Most afternoons, he can be found at Silver's Gymnasium on Irvin in Plymouth. He also works parttime at the gym.

**DIETING** IS the hardest part for Goss, who enjoys going to all-you-can-eat restaurants. In order to minimize fat and build muscles, he eats lean red meat, chicken and fish. Fruits provide energy for workouts.

"You have to push yourself," said Goss. "For two years, I used to eat 36 raw eggs a day. Once a week I eat junk food."

"At the time I'm eating them, I say I can work it off, but by the time I finish, I realize it's going to add a pound. I can tell a day or two afterward (that I have eaten junk food)."

The contests — which consist of posing in a bikini to show overall body size and symmetry — is the easy part, the culmination of the training, said Goss.

**IT'S "IMPOSSIBLE"** to be modest about his body, said Goss.

"I'm accused of having an ego," he said. "A lot of times it's just telling the truth. I get a lot of attention — stares. Girls giggle."

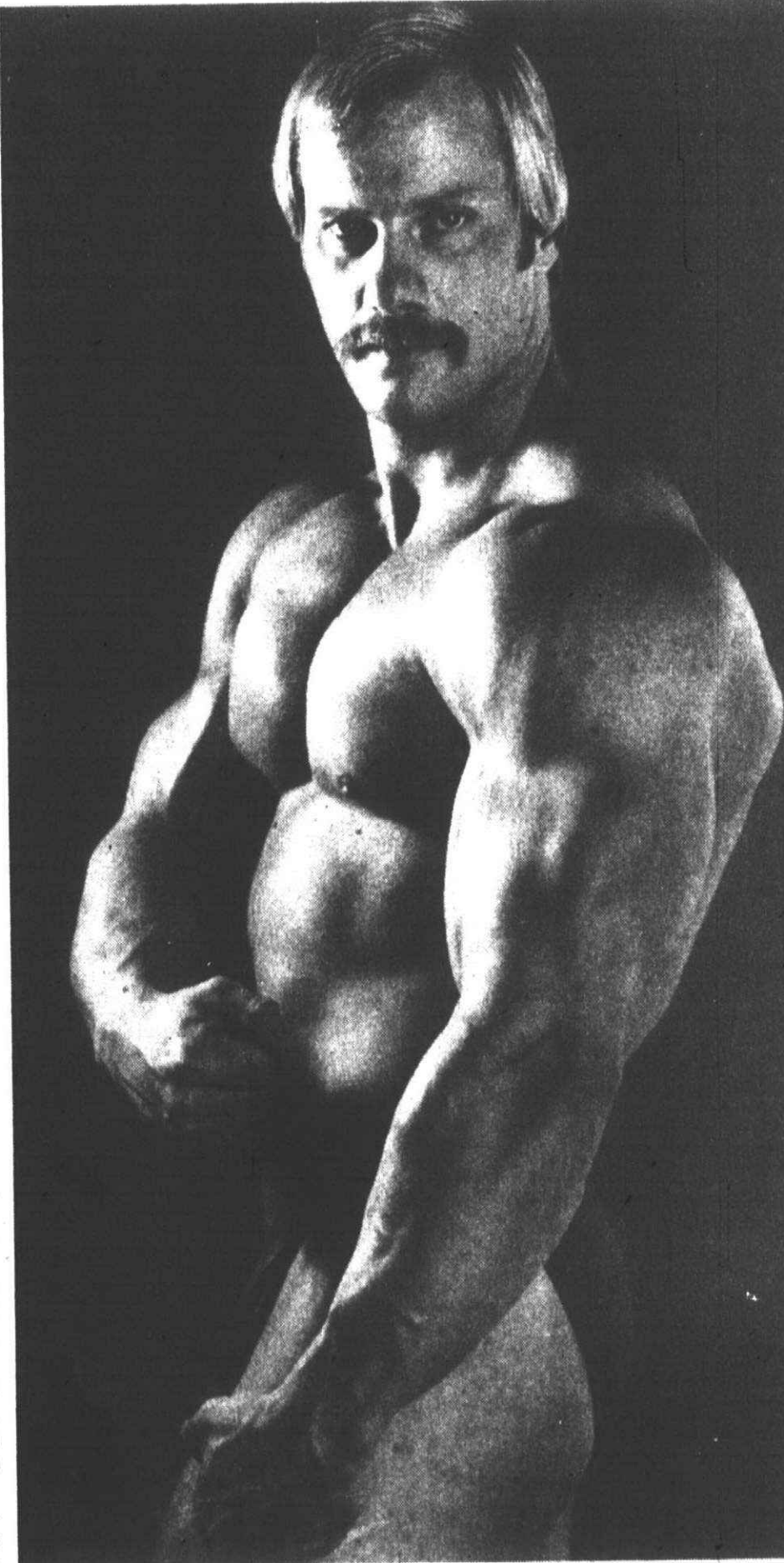
Goss says he "tries not to" wear shorts, because he attracts attention.

"People are astonished (and) make comments," said Goss. "Ninety-five

percent of the guys want to have a body like mine — maybe not as big."

Goss said his girlfriend, who is going to chiropractic school in Georgia, also is into body-building. "For a girl, she has more muscles than I do," he said.

# Libraries get computer for check out

Plymouth's Dunning-Hough Library and Canton Public Library soon will use a computer to check out library books to patrons. The libraries will be connected with the Wayne Oakland Library Federation.

An automated circulation system, bought from Cincinnati Electronics, is designed to enable the two libraries to check items out and in more rapidly.

Each library book will be assigned its own computer bar-code similar to those used on groceries. Each resident also will have a library card with a unique bar-code.

Readers will receive the library cards from the library in the community where they live. Each resident will have only one library card, valid at any Wayne-Oakland Library Federation member library.

The libraries will begin issuing cards this month.

Patrons must show valid identification with current address in order to receive a card. Driver license, voter registration, utility bills or other items with address are useful. Persons under

18 must have a parent's signature on the application form.

WHEN AN ITEM is borrowed, the computer will scan the library card and the items to be borrowed and will link the information in the computer.

The system is supposed to be faster and more accurate. It will reduce staff time required to process overdue notices. It will end long searches of the shelves for books patrons have requested.

The system also is designed to prevent unauthorized use of a lost or stolen card. When readers wish to borrow materials that are checked out, the librarian can let them know the date the desired materials is due in the library.

In addition, each library will be able to see the status of the books owned by the other library. Via the computer, the librarian will know whether books owned by the other library are checked out. The two libraries also will have access to eight other libraries with their 350,000 books.

More of the 60 member libraries in the Wayne-Oakland Library Federation are expected eventually to use the computers for circulation, increasing the size to more than 3 million books. The network is designed to make it possible to speed up inter-library loans by quickly checking on the status of desired books.

BY SHARING THE COST of the central computer, the Canton and Plymouth libraries hope to save money while providing better service. Staff time should be saved by the computer. The automated circulation system will be in use in late this year, library

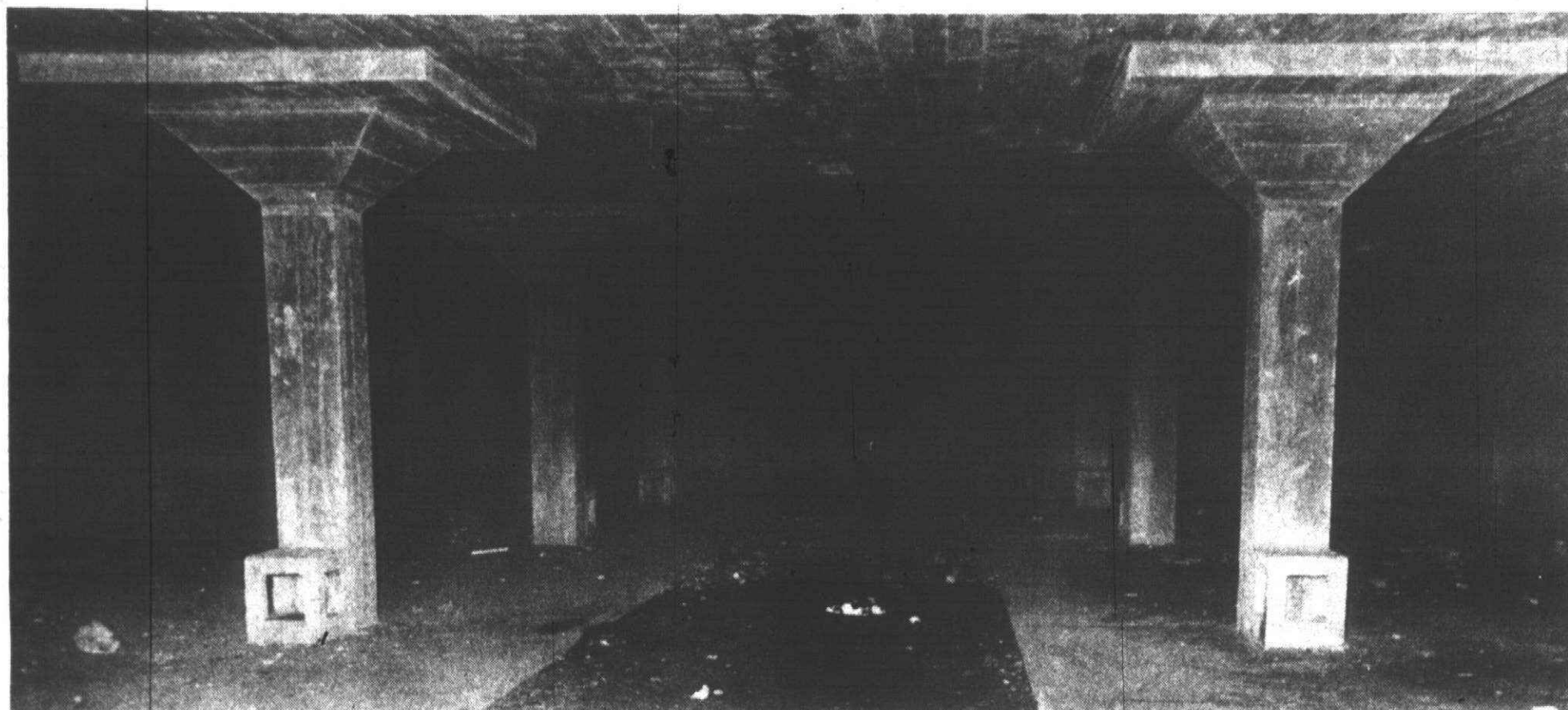

## Building hazards spur demolition

If the price is right, Wayne County will order the demolition of 11 structures on the grounds of "Eloise." Some of the other 40 buildings will be boarded up.

A county poor farm in the 1800s, Eloise was the name given to the complex of buildings that housed the mentally impaired and their caretakers.

The red brick structures have been a familiar sight to those who passed the campus with several hundred acres of land lining both sides of Michigan Avenue at Merriman. At one time, Eloise was almost a city — it had its own post office, police and fire protection services.

NOW THE ISSUE of who will provide those services is forcing the county to consider demolishing the abandoned buildings.

"It's sad to see them (the buildings) sitting here when they're so well constructed. But it isn't feasible to use them," said Thomas Presnell, a Wayne County Commissioner, whose district includes Westland and Garden City.

The county, trying to ease its budget deficits, has gone to court to force the City of Westland to provide fire protection for the complex. Balking at the cost of the extra work, city fire officials have argued that the condition of the buildings makes fire protection impossible.

DESPITE INTEREST expressed by several groups in some of the buildings, county officials say the only real solution is to tear the structures down.

The Wayne-Westland Art Association had wanted to take over the Gruber Auditorium as a cultural center. The Nankin Transit Commission, which serves Garden City, Canton Township, Westland and Wayne, had wanted to

use part of a building for offices and storage.

And First Step, a group which aids battered spouses, had wanted to use one structure for its programs.

But county officials say that the old interior design of the buildings, the cost of renovating structures with 18-inch thick interior walls and the need to bring them up to code would prohibit those uses.

THE COUNTY spent \$1½ million to renovate one building for jail use, Presnell said, but still required a special dispensation by the state corrections department to avoid having to bring it up to code.

"There is no way we could avoid starting from scratch," said Ed Kopey, assistant director of the county buildings division.

Accompanying Kopey on a tour of the buildings recently were Presnell, who heads a special study group on the building problem; Russ Hofer, a county architect; and Harold Saneske, a county plumber who has worked extensively throughout the building complex.

THE TOUR reviewed conditions in two brick houses, one of the larger red brick hospital structures and the auditorium, all north of Michigan Avenue, and root cellars on the south side of Michigan Avenue.

Peeling paint, buckled floors, broken glass, debris and falling plaster were evident in the multi-story brick cottage and smaller brick bungalow which had been used as residences.

Moisture had penetrated through the plaster and studding of the buildings, damaging both since the heat had been turned off two years ago, Hofer said.

In one building, peeling paint revealed oak woodwork and doors.

"IF WE COULD have kept the heat on, we wouldn't have that problem," said Kopey.

But the county's budget deficit and problems with youths breaking into the buildings forced the heat turnoff.

Other problems in the buildings include improper fire exists and heating and plumbing and wiring that aren't up to code.

Those kinds of problems are compounded in the larger buildings where the interior design makes them useless, according to Hofer.

H Building, for instance, is carved into wards with small, cell-like rooms without any plumbing. A walk through the building showed a floor with one room for washbasins, one room for toilets and another room with a single bathtub.

PLUMBING THROUGHOUT the complex was in need of major renovation, Saneske said.

Differences in the way psychiatric patients are treated today in hospital settings makes the old buildings obsolete, Hofer said.

"A new building would more efficiently meet requirements (for treatment)," he explained.

Facilities for the handicapped are non-existent in the buildings and stairways aren't in the proper locations, making renovation a very expensive prospect, Hofer added.

The only possible use for the buildings, which everyone agreed were well-constructed, was for offices, he said. But the 18-inch-thick walls would make renovation difficult, Hofer said.

Little can be salvaged from the buildings. Stoves and other equipment still in the building are no longer being manufactured, so repair parts are unavailable, Kopey said.

"We had people come in and take a look at the stoves, but it wasn't even worth taking them out for scrap," said Kopey.

ALSO DARK and unheated is the Gruber Auditorium, unusual for its three stages and dressing rooms located under the main, center stage.

Everything from piano recitals to weekly church services for patients were conducted at the auditorium. Perhaps its most recent use was several years ago when the Wayne-Westland Art Association held a Gong Show there.

Recently, an electric organ was stolen from the auditorium.

Conditions are better inside this building, a Public Works Project opened in 1939.

Auditorium seats are still nicely upholstered, but windows have been broken, the roof leaks and the facility doesn't meet code requirements, according to officials.

SOUTH OF Michigan Avenue are two root cellars, massive underground structures supported by huge columns and hidden by large mounds of earth. Officials say that the cellars have been hangouts for motorcyclists and drug users.

All of the facilities were constructed after 1900. None has historical value, officials say.

Presnell, who at one time lived near the Eloise complex, said he remembers when the buildings housed POGIES (Poor Old Guys In Eloise) as well as the mentally impaired.

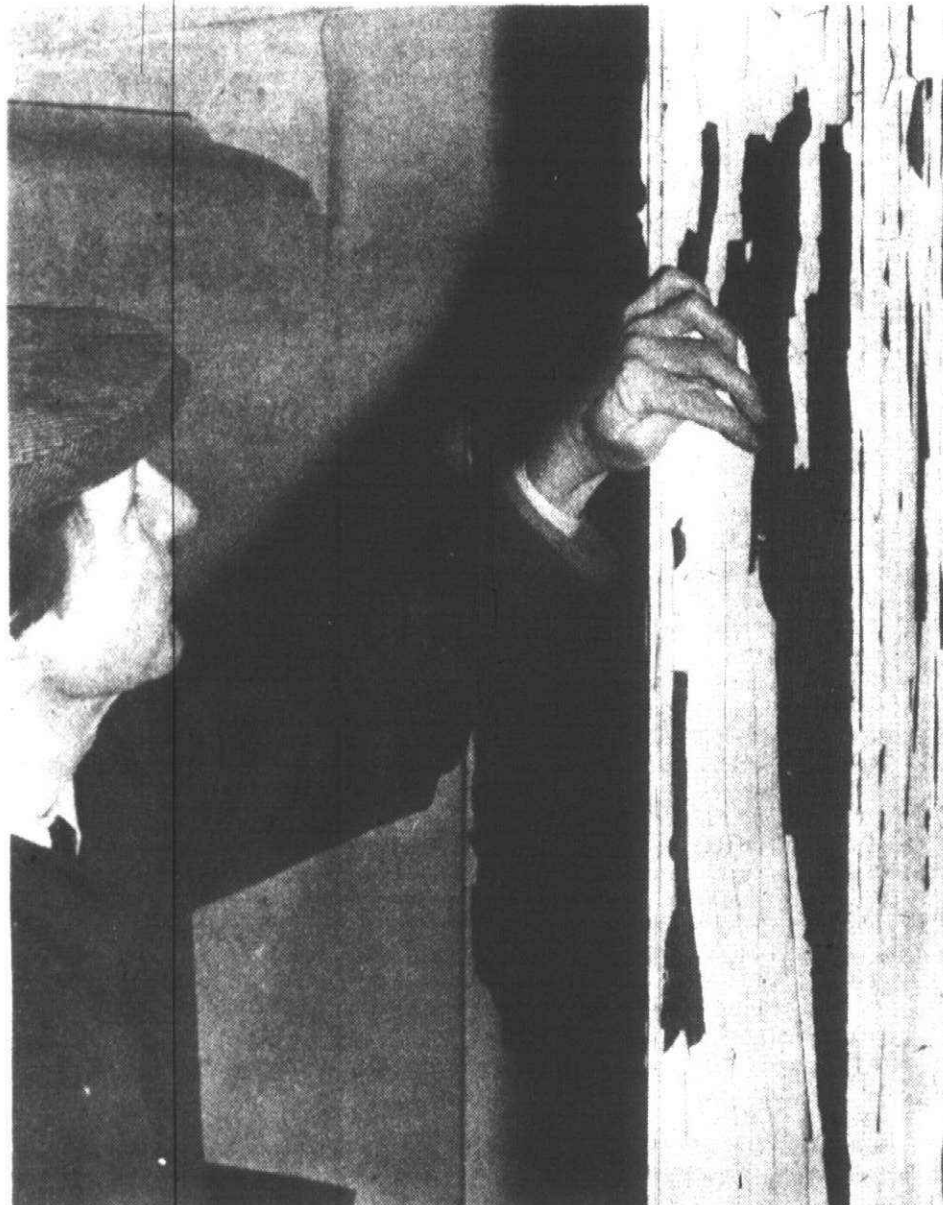
Now he would like to see the county sell the land for use as an industrial park, he said.



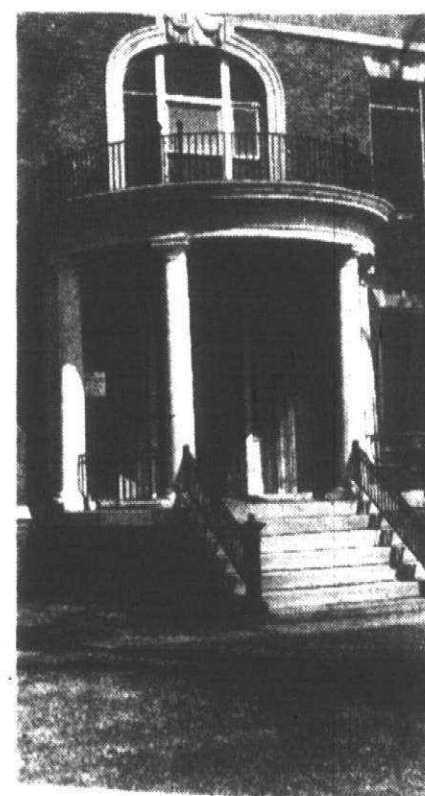
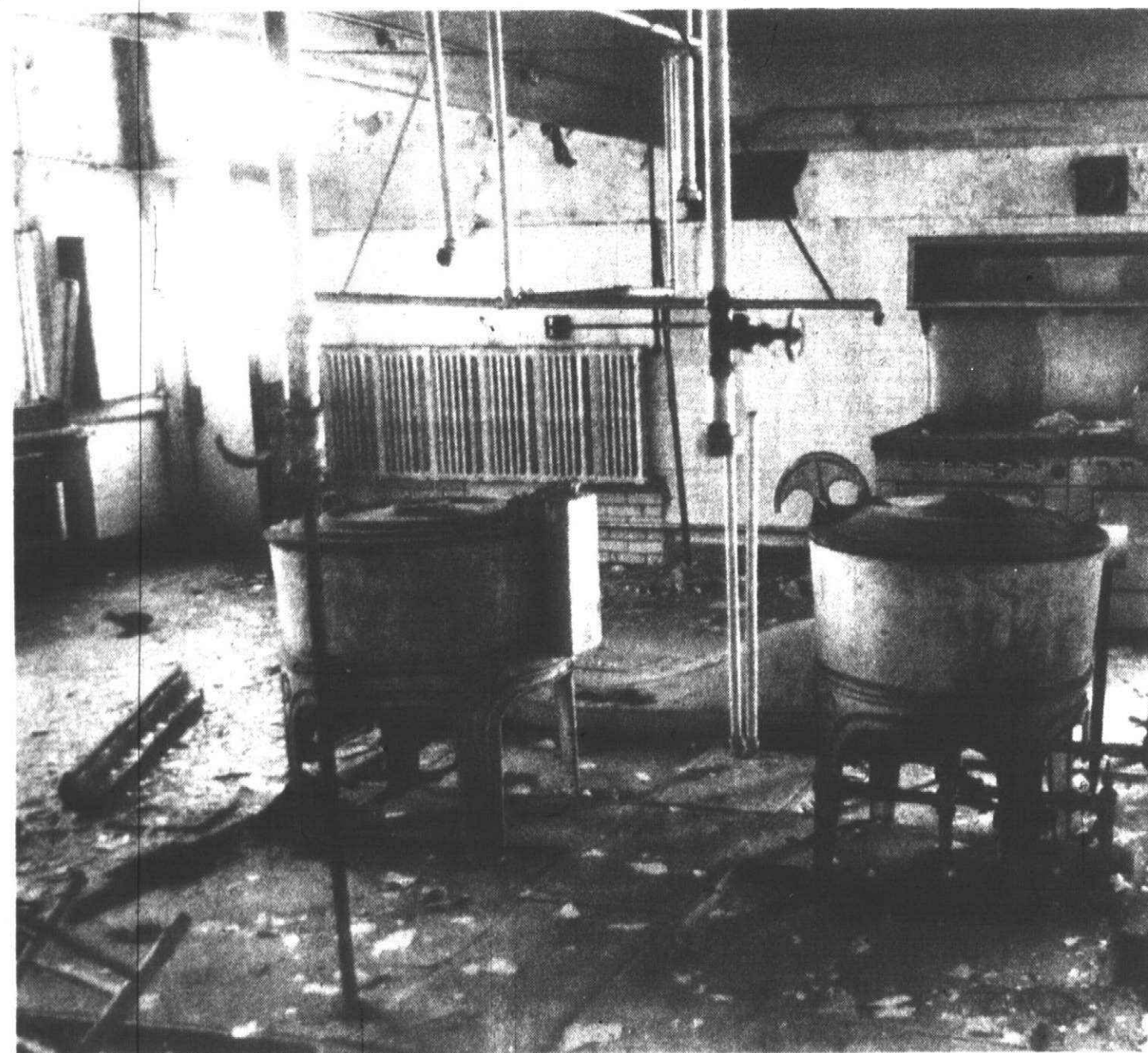
Architect Ross Hofer (left) and Ed Kopey, assistant director of the buildings division, discuss the interior condition of the brick cottage to be demolished.

## Dunn Steel leaves Plymouth

Plymouth's Dunn Steel has moved its operations to Spencer, Tenn., leaving behind 110 hourly workers.

Although the workers, members of UAW Local 985, had a relocation clause in their contract, none is going to Tennessee.

Shop steward Leonard Hulack cites the drop in pay as the main reason the union members decided to take severance pay rather than move.

"The company wasn't really interested in taking the workers with them. They want to get away from unions," said Hulack.

One union member interested in moving was offered \$5.70 an hour, compared to his current \$12 an hour, Hulack said.

"THE MONEY and benefits in Tennessee just aren't the same. The general feeling is they don't want us down there," he said.

Dunn Steel, a division of Textron Inc., is paying union members \$75 for each year of service.

The company is taking 14 salary employees to Spencer, said plant manager Mac Case, who declined comment

Dan Isakson, a Detroit firefighter, learned of Linda's illness through his mother, Pat Isakson, who lives near the Wittens on Old Bridge in Canton.

Isakson headed a collection drive. About \$2,500 in donations were deposited in a fund set up at Michigan Savings and Loan in Canton.

In March, Linda, her brother Michael, a student at Field, and their parents, Tommy and Susan, took their Disney World trip.

"She was a gutsy little kid," said Isakson. "She got her trip."

The expressions of warmth and love made Linda feel "very special," said Mrs. Witten at the time of the trip.

Besides her parents and brother, Linda is survived by her grandparents, Arthur and Virginia Monks of Belleville. Memorial donations may be sent to the Michigan Cancer Foundation or to Field Elementary School in Canton.

"There is one out-of-state firm and one in-state firm which are interested," said Angel, who declined to name the firms.

"CURRENTLY, THERE are preliminary negotiations going on between a large investment group and a potential occupant of the building," he said.

Injuries are a worry. While working as a bouncer near Atlanta, Ga., Goss ended up having 80 stitches from various bar fights.

"If I ever got a serious injury, I would have to change my whole thinking for future occupation or future goals," said Goss.

GOSS PLANS to go to California next year, establish residency and enter the Mr. California competition, which he considers more prestigious than being Mr. Michigan.

"Hopefully, I can be a professional when I go to California." As a professional, he could endorse body-building equipment, health foods or vitamins.

Other options include taking college classes in nutrition or working as a security person or bodyguard.

Body-builders can compete 20 years or more, said Goss. Quitting doesn't mean muscles will turn to flab, he said. Instead, the muscles would shrink, and he'd lose weight.

CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH  
WAYNE COUNTY, MICHIGAN

ORDINANCE NO. 81

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ESTABLISHING AN ORDINANCE DESIGNED TO PROHIBIT THE GROWTH OF NOXIOUS WEEDS AND WILD GRASS, AND THE SCATTERING OR DEPOSITING OF FOUL SEEDS IN URBANIZED AREAS OF THE TOWNSHIP, PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS

### PART I.

Pursuant to the Charter Township Act, No. 175 of the Public Acts of 1974, as amended, being SS42.1, et seq., of Michigan Compiled Law, the Charter Township of Plymouth hereby ordains the following:

### PART II.

This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited, amended and supplemented as the Weed Control Ordinance.

### PART III.

The purpose of this Ordinance shall be to eliminate the existence of noxious weeds, wild grass, or foul seeds in urbanized areas of the Charter Township of Plymouth.

### PART IV.

The Chief Building Official of the Township is hereby appointed to enforce the sections of this Ordinance. The Chief Building Official shall have such power so long as he is Chief Building Official for the Charter Township of Plymouth. The Chief Building Official shall duly appoint agents and delegate authority as he deems fit so as to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

### PART V.

For the purposes of this Ordinance, the terms noxious weeds, wild grass, and foul seeds shall mean any plant which grows where not wanted or seeds of such plants the growth of which will be undesirable. These terms may hereinafter be referred to as "weeds."

### PART VI.

The Chief Building Official shall diligently inquire concerning the growth and existence of weeds in urbanized areas of the Township. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "urbanized area" shall include all areas in the Township east of Beck Road other than areas in, along or adjacent to roads which fall under the responsibility of the Wayne County Road Commission or the State Department of Transportation. The Chief Building Official shall carefully seek and learn the best methods of the weeds' destruction, and he shall persistently apply in proper time such remedy or treatment as shall be best calculated to prevent the spread and to eradicate the same.

### PART VII.

It shall be the duty of all owners of land on which weeds are found growing, to destroy the weeds before they reach a seed bearing stage and to prevent such weeds from perpetuating themselves, or to prevent such weeds from becoming a detriment to public health.

The Chief Building Official shall notify by certified mail with return receipt requested, the owner, agent or occupant of any lands on which weeds are found growing; prima facie the owner shall be the person whose name and address are set forth upon the tax rolls. Such notice shall contain methods of treating and eradicating such weeds and a summary of the provisions of this part of the Ordinance. Failure of the Chief Building Official to give such notice shall not, however, constitute a defense to any action to enforce the payment of any penalty provided for a debt created under the provisions of this Ordinance. In case any such owner, agent or occupant shall refuse to destroy such weeds or cause the same to be destroyed, it shall be the duty of the Chief Building Official to enter upon such lands and to destroy such weeds or cause the same to be destroyed. Express power to so enter upon such lands and to destroy such weeds is hereby conferred upon the Chief Building Official. Any expense incurred in such destruction shall be paid by the owner or owners of such lands, and the Township shall have lien against such lands for such expense, which lien shall be enforced in the manner now provided by law for the enforcement of Mechanics' Liens.

### PART VIII.

The provisions of this part shall apply to the following:

A. The owner, agent or occupant of any subdivided land in any subdivision in which buildings have been erected on 60 percent of the lots included in that subdivision.

B. Owners, agents or occupants of lots along all streets in common usage, for a depth of 160 feet or the depth of the lot, whichever is lesser.

If these persons have failed, after ten days of the notice referred to in Part VII, to destroy such weeds or cause the same to be destroyed, then the Chief Building Official or his authorized agent may enter upon such subdivided lands or lots and destroy by cutting down or without mechanical equipment which will not damage the property or the sidewalk adjacent thereto, any weeds, and all expenses incurred in the destruction shall be paid by the owner or owners of such subdivided lands or lots for such expense, such lien to be enforced in the manner provided by the State law pertaining to the enforcement of Mechanics' Liens. Any owner who shall refuse to destroy such weeds, as provided for in this Ordinance, shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00; said fine when collected to be paid to the Chief Building Official and shall become part of the general funds of the Township. Nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to weeds and fields devoted to growing any small grain crops such as wheat, oats, barley or rye. In the case of easement, property or properties such as abandoned subdivisions, gravel pits and public properties and all other lands where definite ownership is not known to the Chief Building Official and cannot be established, it shall be the duty of the Chief Building Official to cause the destruction of weeds in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

### PART IX.

The Chief Building Official shall report to the State Department of Conservation indicating to the Department of Conservation any lands within the Charter Township of Plymouth which are state-owned lands, for the purposes of the Department's enforcement of state laws pertaining to weeds.

### PART X.

The Chief Building Official shall apply the best known means, and use the utmost diligence in eradicating weeds; but he shall not have power to expend in work or materials more than \$25.00 on any one infested tract, without the advice and consent in writing of the Township Board.

### PART XI.

In addition to the Chief Building Official's aforementioned duties, it shall be the duty of the Chief Building Official to prosecute or complain to the proper authorities of any person or corporation who may violate this Ordinance or any amendments thereto. In addition to the aforementioned rights to enter upon the subdivided lands or lots or owners, agents or occupants of such property, the Chief Building Official shall also have the right to issue tickets or summonses after the ten day notice referred to in Part VIII has expired.

### PART XII.

The Chief Building Official shall, annually before the first day of December, make a written report to the Township Board, containing such information with reference to the existence and growth of weeds as the Chief Building Official deems necessary.

### PART XIII.

The Township Board shall audit the accounts of the Chief Building Official with regard to the control and destruction of weeds, both for the Chief Building Official's services and for the money expended or labor employed by the Chief Building Official; and they shall provide for the payment as they now do for other municipal expenses.

### PART XIV.

The Township Board may make appropriations from the Township Treasury to aid in destroying the weeds in the Township, and in case it deems it expedient, it may assume control over any one tract or of all the weeds in the Township and make such provisions as it may deem necessary, and impose penalties, not exceeding \$100.00 for each offense, for violation of any provision made by it on this subject, to be used for by the Chief Building Official, in the name and for the use of the Township before any Judge having jurisdiction. Whenever the Township Board shall decide to assume control, and so long as they exercise it, its jurisdiction shall be superior to that of the Chief Building Official.

### PART XV.

Severability. This Ordinance and various parts and sections and clauses thereof, are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, section, paragraph or clause is adjudged invalid, it is hereby provided that the remainder of the Ordinance shall be affected thereby.

### PART XVI.

Repeal. All other Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistencies, hereby repealed.

### PART XVII.

Publication. The Township Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published in the manner required by law.

### PART XVIII.

Date of Effect. This Ordinance is hereby declared necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the Charter Township of Plymouth and is hereby given immediate effect following publication June 14, 1982.

This Ordinance was duly adopted by the Township Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Plymouth at its regular meeting called and held on the eighth day of June, A.D. 1982, and was ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.

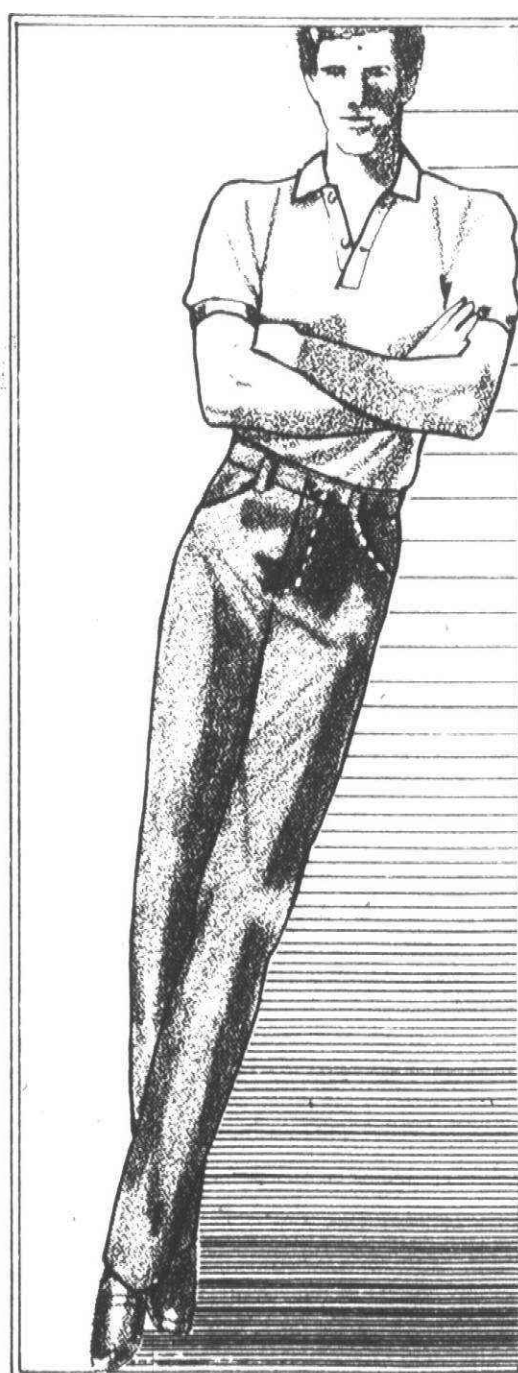

# College established by landslide on second try

(Part VI)

During the first unsuccessful campaign to establish Schoolcraft Community College, Paul Chandler (who supported the issue in the Plymouth Mail and Livonia Observer) had been on the receiving end of several barbs launched from the pen of Jack Edwards MacGriff, director of the Redford Township News.

When the proposition lost on June 12, 1961, Chandler went on the offensive. In his Livonia Observer on June 14, Chandler wrote that the first election was influenced by "a heavy helping of anti-propaganda laid down by a tabloid publisher who handled the truth just about as loosely as is possible and still not be stoned in the marketplace."

Chandler went on to say that the loss in the Redford districts had left "many heavy hearts among the Redford educationists who did a mighty job of trying to aid a good cause."

MACGRIFF'S RIVAL newspaper, the Livonia News, reported the election under the headline, "Two Redford Township School Areas Refuse to 'Go Along' with Scheme."

MacGriff said that among the reasons he declined to go along with promoting the college was his belief that

"the actual cost of the Community College would be as much and in some cases more than costs prevailing in the existing 11 colleges and universities, all within 25 miles of Redford Township and Livonia."

MacGriff accused the various boards of education in the six communities of "dipping into their already-depleted treasuries to furnish high-powered protagonists for the Community College." He wrote that he was proud that although five other newspapers circulating in the communities affected had staunchly supported the Community College idea, the analysis carried in his two newspapers prevailed in the Redfords, which turned down "the educationists' scheme."

DURING THE SECOND campaign to establish the college, South Redford

and Redford Union were not involved, but MacGriff continued to criticize the Redford school boards for adhering to their commitment to help pay the costs associated with the first attempt.

And MacGriff still was in a position to influence the outcome of the second election through the pages of his Livonia News. But on Sept. 1, Eric Bradner was told by one of the newspaper's employees that MacGriff would probably not oppose the college proposal during the second election.

On Oct. 17, however, (one week before the election) those favoring the college were disturbed by a rumor that the MacGriff newspapers were about to unleash an anti-community college drive. It never materialized.

I TALKED to MacGriff recently, 20 years after the events recounted, to ask what his viewpoint is today.

"There is nothing wrong with the college today," he told me. "I was for the college once it got substance behind it. What I opposed was politics of those in Livonia who tried to get it located there, and the land speculators who advocated establishment of the college in order to make money."

In all controversies of this type, there is usually a measure of truth in the arguments put forth by both sides. But MacGriff never seems to have given proper weight to the motives of the six superintendents of school, the members of the six boards of education, and the multitude of people of all six communities who supported the issue without any hope, or desire, of material gain.

CHANDLER, WHO supported the college from the inception of the idea, was senator-elect for the 1965-66 session of the Michigan State Legislature. Before he was installed into office, he died of a heart attack at age 45.

On Oct. 18, 1961, a letter from Gov. John B. Swainson was published, strongly backing the effort to found a community college in the area. On Oct. 22, two days before the election, the Detroit Free Press indicated that the

new proposal called for a 1,250-student operation with a \$4.5-million plant. The original plan had been for 2,000 students with a \$6.4-million facility.

The cost to the taxpayers in the four districts was to be the same as under the original plan — another \$1 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. Half of the money would be used for operation and the rest to retire a bond issue for construction of the buildings. The electorate was not asked to vote on the money problem on Oct. 24 — only whether to establish the college and on the election of trustees to govern it.

ON ELECTION DAY, the college proposition won by what the Livonia City-Post termed a landslide.

Of the total 9,295 votes cast in the four communities, 6,695 (or 72 percent) favored the establishment of the college.

In Clarenceville, 386 were for and 231 against; in Garden City 2,161 were for and 366 against; in Livonia 3,117 were for and 1,574 against; and in Plymouth 1,031 were in favor of the college and 429 were against.

There was no contest for the district board posts because there only was one candidate from each district. Paul Mutnick won a board seat from Clarenceville, L. Clarke Oldenburg from Garden City, Ward McCain from Livonia and Harold E. Fischer from Plymouth.

Of the six at-large candidates, the three who won a place on the board of trustees were Jane Moehle, Charles Kirpatrick and James O'Neil.

All of the seven who formed the first board of Schoolcraft Community College had previously won in the first election when the college issue had failed.

## A marathon around the loop road?

The skeptics no longer are snickering over the thought of transforming the streets of downtown Detroit into a race track.

They couldn't snicker any longer when more than 100,000 people turned out to watch the cars vie for fame and fortune over the zig-zag course.

When the "odd" race was ended — or called off because of a time limit — it was said the Grand Prix was a howling success because it drew that many people into the area and brought business to the troubled merchants. They had been moaning over the state of the economy.

So, maybe it is time that we revived the thoughts of a loop road in Plymouth.

IT HAS been the greater part of 10 years since that noble idea was abandoned. It was conceived to aid business and not to be the scene of a wild automobile race.

It had been talked about for years. In its final stage, the loop was to run one

block away in both sides of Main Street. That is, the route would be on Harvey from Church to Wing, then left to Deer or Union and left again to Church and back to Harvey.

The thought was to ease conditions on Main Street and take the automobiles away from in front the stores to give customers a real chance to enjoy a shopping trip to the city.

Sounds strange, doesn't it? But if you take notice of the motel rooms constructed in the rear of the Meeting House, you will note that they face Deer Street.

AT THE time, it was thought to be

an ideal location and the tenants would have a nice view of the main route of traffic through the city.

But when it came time to close the action, city commissioners became entangled in a discussion of how much of a pitch the road should have on the turns.

They were agreed that the road was not to be a flat surface on the curbs but should aid the motorist by having a pitch on the turns.

How much of a pitch?

For a good question.

For about 30 years, the loop road had been talked about. Time after time, it was put back on the shelf. Then, about

10 years ago, it was revived by such keen-minded commissioners as James McKeon and James Jabara.

BUT LIKE their predecessors, they became tied up in the pitch of the road on the turns as if it were to be a small version of the Indianapolis speedway. So, the matter was dropped again.

But now that the present generation goes for oddities, it might be timely to revive the loop road. Not for automobiles, but for a lot of other activities. For instance, it could be the finishing section of an annual marathon race and in time be a duplicate of the Boston race that draws thousands.

The race could be along the various roads leading into the city, with the finish at Kellogg Park in the heart of the business district.

The famous Boston marathon isn't run entirely in Boston. And don't forget that the recently abandoned chicken-flying contest drew goodly crowds to the business district and allowed a lot of window shopping on a Sunday.

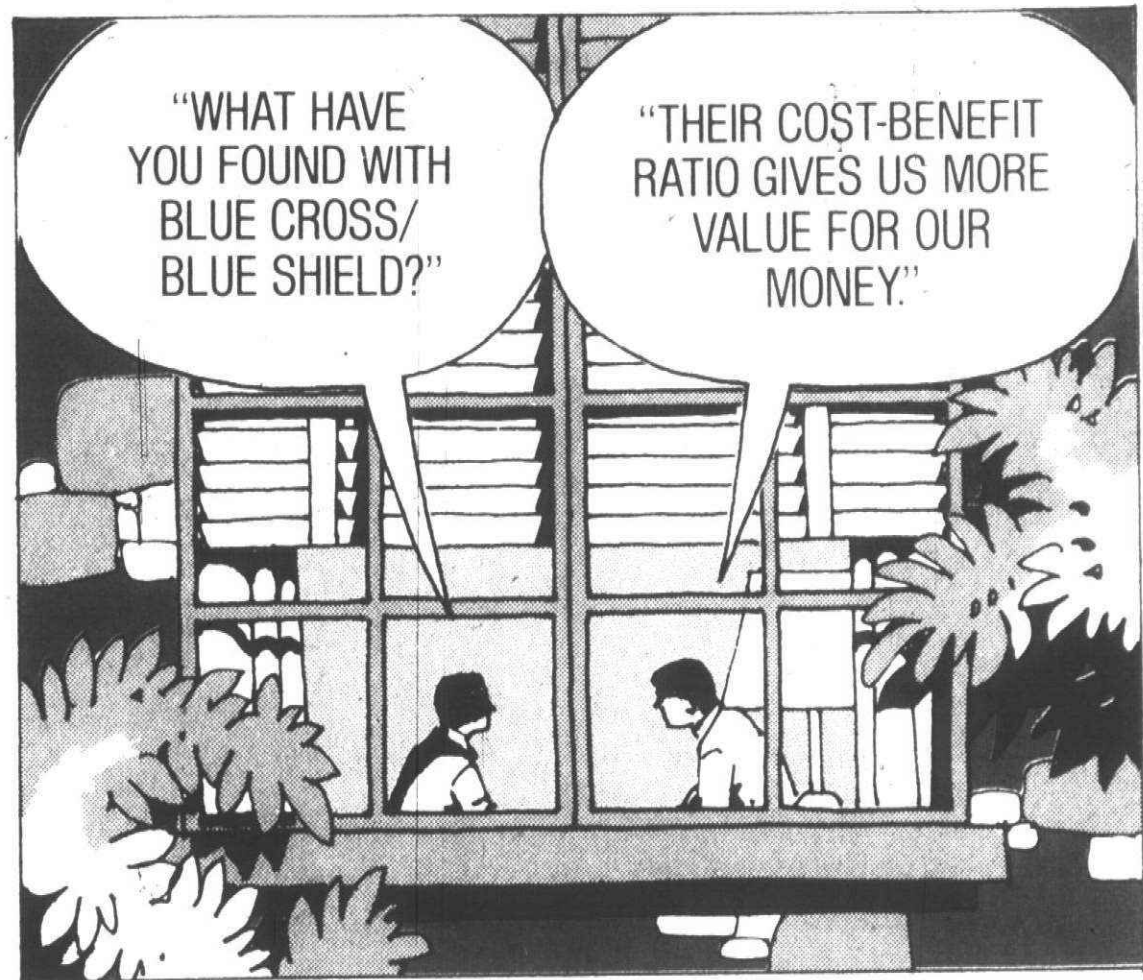
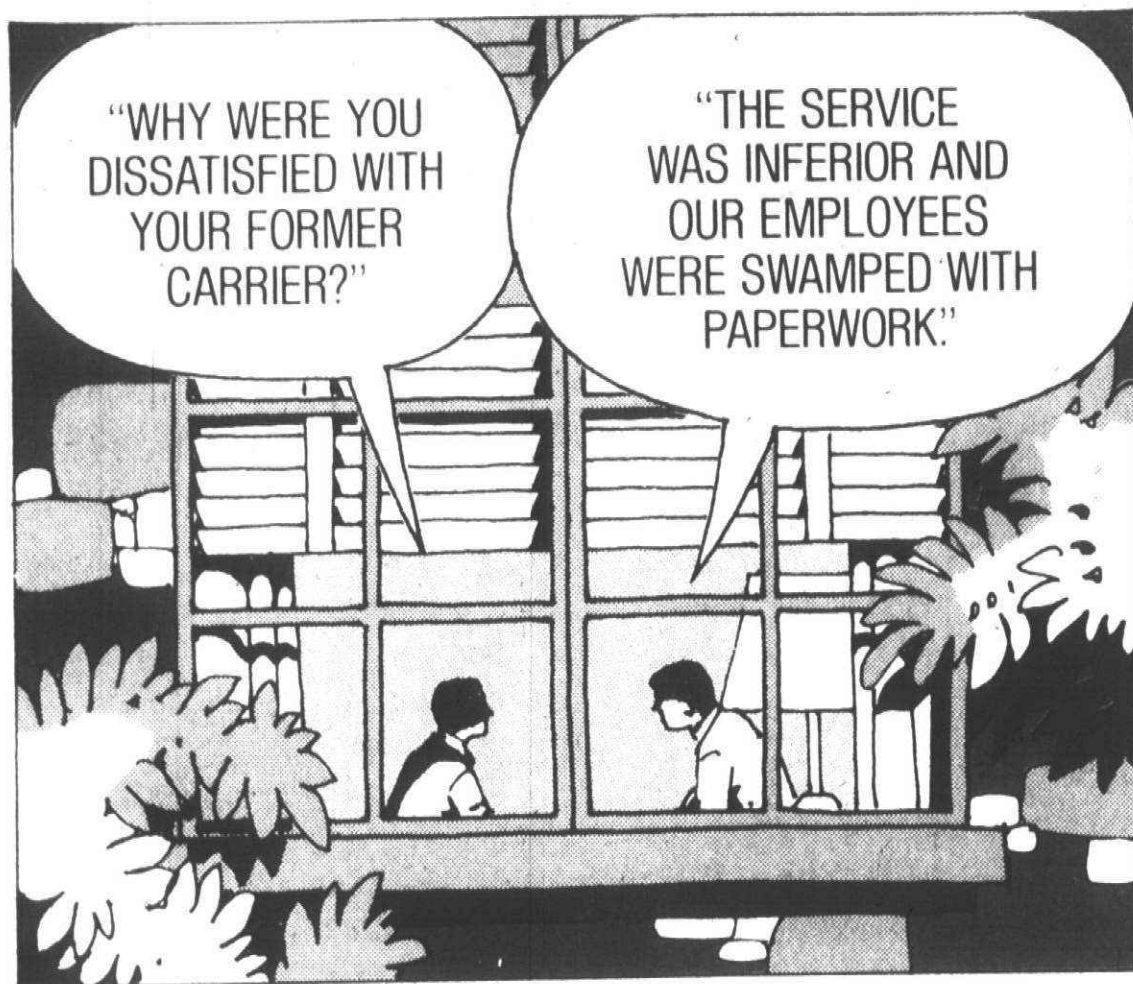

# Fruit: Color it Wonderful

What's red, blue, green, yellow and orange — and good all over? Fruit, of course. Glorious, wonderful, colorful fruit is, perhaps, the sweetest of all nature's gifts.

Nutritionists teach that fruit belongs in everyone's diet. While all fruits supply dietary fiber, citrus fruits and strawberries contribute vitamin C, oranges and bananas are good sources of potassium, peaches and apricots are high in vitamin A and pineapples provide thiamine.

Fruit is good enough to be enjoyed as nature grew it, fresh from tree, bush or plant. Fruits combine well with one another, too, in beauty and flavor and new ways to use summer fruits seem to be endless.

One of the recipes, Strawberry Peach No-Cook Jam, makes it possible to store away the summertime goodness of fresh fruit for enjoyment all year round.

No-cook jam, developed only in recent years, is fresher tasting and more colorful than traditional jams. The corn syrup contributes both to the natural, unmasked fruity flavor and to the glossy appearance. In the Strawberry Tart, corn syrup provides an attractive, easy glaze, and in Peach Raspberry Sherbet, it aids in the prevention of large ice crystals forming, thereby reducing grittiness or graininess. Enjoy the fruits of summer in these new colorful ways.

## Raspberry Peach Sherbet

- 1 envelope unflavored gelatin
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2 cups sliced peaches
- 1 cup raspberries
- 1 cup light corn syrup

In small saucepan sprinkle gelatin over milk. Stir over low heat until dissolved. Place in blender container. Add peaches, raspberries and corn syrup; cover. Blend on high speed 30 seconds. Pour into 9 x 9 x 2-inch pan. Cover; freeze overnight. Soften slightly at room temperature, about 15 minutes. Spoon into large mixer bowl. With mixer at low speed, beat until smooth, but not melted. Pour into 4-cup mold or freezer container. Cover; freeze about 4 hours or until firm. Unmold or soften at room temperature for easier scooping. Makes about 4 cups.

## Peach Strawberry No-Cook Jam

- 1 pound (about) fully ripe peaches
- 1 pint fully ripe strawberries
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 1/2 cup light corn syrup
- 4-1/2 cups sugar
- 3/4 cup water
- 1 package (1-3/4 oz) powdered fruit pectin

Rinse, peel and pit peaches. Finely chop peaches using fine blade of food grinder. Measure 1 cup. Rinse and stem strawberries; fully crush, one layer at a time, to let juice flow freely. Measure 1 cup. Turn into 4-quart bowl. Add lemon juice; stir well. Add corn syrup; stir well. Add sugar, stirring thoroughly to dissolve. Let stand 10 minutes. In small saucepan mix water and fruit pectin. Stirring constantly, bring to boil over medium heat and boil 1 minute. Turn into fruit mixture. Stir vigorously 3 minutes. Ladle into 1/2 or 1-pint freezer containers leaving 1/2-inch headspace (no paraffin needed). Cover with tight lids. Let stand at room temperature until set. (It may take up to 24 hours.) Jam to be eaten within a week or two may be stored in refrigerator. Store remainder in freezer and transfer to refrigerator as needed. Makes 7 (1/2-pint) containers.

**Note:** With MCP jam and jelly pectin (2 oz) use 2 pounds peaches and 1 pint strawberries, and directions in the package for no-cook jam.

## Strawberry Banana Cooler

- 1 cup strawberries, hulled
- 1 banana, peeled, sliced
- 1 pint vanilla ice cream
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup light corn syrup

In blender container place strawberries, banana, ice cream, milk and corn syrup; cover. Blend on high speed 30 seconds or until well blended. Makes about 4 cups.

**Blueberry Banana Cooler:** Follow recipe for Strawberry Banana Cooler. Omit strawberries. Use 1 cup blueberries.



## Strawberry Tart

- 3/4 cup unsifted flour
- 1/4 cup corn starch
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup corn oil margarine
- 1 egg yolk, lightly beaten
- 1 pint (about) strawberries, hulled
- 1/4 cup light corn syrup
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice

Line large cookie sheet with waxed paper. In medium bowl stir together flour, corn starch and sugar. With pastry blender or 2 knives cut in margarine until coarse crumbs form. With fork, stir in egg yolk. Press dough firmly into ball with hands (mixture is crumbly) until it will hold together. On cookie sheet flatten dough slightly and roll out until slightly larger than a 12 x 6-inch rectangle. Trim to 12 x 6-inch rectangle. (Reserve excess dough.) Cut into 1 (10 x 4-inch) rectangle. Using pastry left after cutting out rectangle, cut 4 (10 x 1/2-inch) strips and 4 (3 x 1/2-inch) strips. Place 1 long strip on each long edge of the rectangle. Top each with one of the remaining long strips. Place 1 short strip on each short edge of the rectangle. Top each with one of the remaining short strips. If desired, cut small shapes from reserved excess dough and place along top strips. Pierce bottom of rectangle with fork. Bake in 400° F oven 8 to 10 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove and cool 5 minutes on wire rack. Remove from cookie sheet. Cool slightly. Remove waxed paper. Cool completely. Arrange strawberries, stem side down, in tart shell. In small saucepan stir together corn syrup and lemon juice. Stirring constantly, cook over low heat 1 minute. (Do not cook longer.) Brush on strawberries. Refrigerate. Brush on strawberries up to 3 hours before serving. If desired, garnish with whipped cream. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

## Strawberry-Tea Drink

- 1 cup strawberries
- 1 cup orange juice
- 1/2 cup light corn syrup
- 2 tablespoons instant tea
- 4 ice cubes

Place strawberries, orange juice, corn syrup, tea and ice cubes in blender container; cover. Blend on high speed 15 seconds or until well blended. Serve over ice in tall glasses. Makes about 3 (1-cup) servings.

## Fruit Compote

- 3/4 cup light corn syrup
- 1/2 cup orange juice
- 2 tablespoons very thin lemon rind strips
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 8 cups assorted fresh fruit, such as blueberries, strawberries, honeydew and cantaloupe melon chunks, peach and plum slices

In large bowl stir together corn syrup, orange juice, lemon rind and juice until well blended. Add fruit; toss to coat well. Cover; refrigerate several hours or until chilled. Makes about 8 cups. (For Fruit Compote in photograph, recipe is doubled.)

## Lime Mousse

- 1 envelope unflavored gelatin
- 1/4 cup cold water
- 3 eggs, separated
- 3/4 cup light corn syrup
- 1 teaspoon grated lime rind
- 1/2 cup lime juice
- 2 drops green food color (optional)
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 cup heavy cream, whipped

In 2-quart saucepan sprinkle gelatin over water. Stir in egg yolks, corn syrup, lime rind and juice. Stirring constantly, cook over low heat until gelatin is completely dissolved, about 5 minutes. Stir in food color. Turn into large bowl. Refrigerate, stirring occasionally, about 1 hour or until mixture mounds slightly when dropped from a spoon. In small bowl with mixer at high speed beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Gradually beat in sugar until stiff peaks form. Fold into lime mixture. Fold in whipped cream. Turn into 2-quart serving dish. Refrigerate 4 hours or until firm. If desired, garnish with additional whipped cream and lime slices. Makes 8 servings.

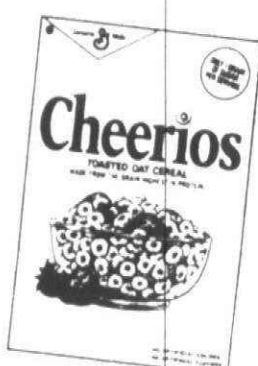

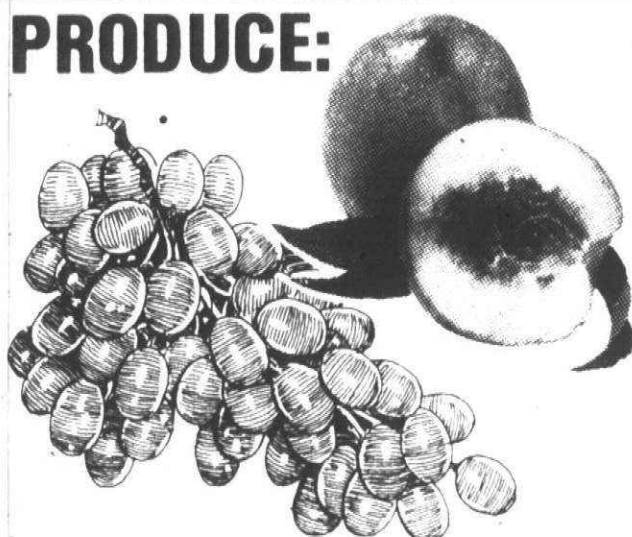

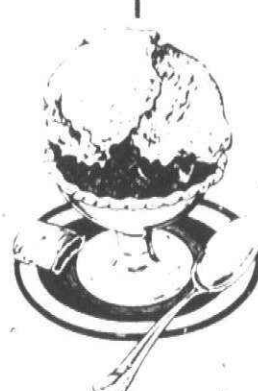

# Seafood

## Don't rely on broiling; try out some new recipes

Bought a new sweat suit lately? Have at least one diet or nutrition book on your book shelf?

If the answer is yes, chances are you're joining the thousands of Americans who are going to have fish for lunch or dinner today.

As a nation, we are becoming increasingly health and nutrition conscious as the belief grows that exercise and good nutrition and diet are part of a desirable quality of life.

The consumer of the '80s perceives fish as a healthful food, as almost every diet from every source includes seafood. Consumption of fish and seafood has increased enormously despite the high cost of fish, compared to many other sources of protein.

Seafood is delicate and sometimes difficult to handle fresh, yet its popularity has outpaced all other protein sources. About 60 percent of the fish sold in the United States goes to food service outlets, and 40 percent is bought in retail stores.

Many people rely solely on broiling when preparing fish. The following recipes were selected to show the many

interesting possibilities when preparing seafood.

### BANANA SOLE

Buy flounder or sole for this recipe. Flounder is a member of the flatfish family, also known as plaice. Flounder is practically identical to sole in appearance, taste and texture. They are often substituted for each other.

This recipe is for one serving:

8-10 ounces sole fillet  
Flour, as needed  
Clarified butter, as needed  
1 banana, quartered lengthwise  
1 1/2 cup brown sugar  
1 1/2 cup banana liqueur

1 1/2 cup pecans, chopped

Dredge fillets in flour and saute in butter or oil until golden brown. In another pan, saute banana in butter, brown sugar and banana liqueur until fruit is lightly brown. Add pecans and stir. Place fish in center of plate and arrange the bananas in a hub around the fish. Pour a bit of the banana liquid over the fish.

### PAELLA

Paella (pronounced pie-a-yah) is a Spanish dish. Few Spaniards agree on what is a "correct" paella; however, it is usually a combination of fish, shellfish, chicken, sausage, green peas, rice, tomatoes, and saffron.

Paella is commonly baked in a wide, shallow pan or any large iron skillet. Like most fish soups and stews, paella is an economical use for scraps and leftovers. Using frozen fish is acceptable. This recipe serves eight.

2 lbs. fryer chicken, cut in eights  
6 oz. lean veal, diced 3/4 inch  
3 oz. olive oil  
2 cloves garlic  
2 peeled tomatoes  
3 cups hot chicken stock  
1/2 tsp. saffron  
16 raw clams in shell  
8 raw shrimp  
8 oz. lobster, raw and cubed  
3 cups cooked rice  
Salt and pepper to taste  
16 asparagus tips, cooked

16 slices of red sweet peppers  
1 cup green peas, canned or frozen  
8 thin slices chorizo  
or hard Spanish sausage

Saute chicken and veal in olive oil until golden brown. Add garlic and tomatoes. Mix well. Add chicken stock and saffron. Then add clams, shrimp and lobster. Stir and cook for 3-4 minutes. Add rice and cook for 4-5 minutes. Salt and pepper to taste.

Add Spanish sausage, peas, asparagus and peppers. Do not stir. Cover and bake in a 350-degree oven for 15 minutes. Serve in the pan.

### ARGENTINE SHRIMP SALAD

Serves one  
5 shrimp, cooked, peeled and deveined (10-15 count)  
1 egg, hard cooked, quartered  
1 tomato, cut in 8 wedges  
2 black olives  
1 lemon wedge  
Salad greens, as needed  
Lettuce, shredded, as needed  
1 sprig parsley

Line a chilled salad bowl with salad greens and shredded lettuce. Arrange shrimp in the middle of bowl and surround with egg and tomato wedges. Garnish with lemon, black olives and parsley. Serve with Argentine dressing.

### ARGENTINE DRESSING

Serves 12  
1 qt. mayonnaise  
1/2 cup onions, chopped fine  
4 oz. catsup  
2 oz. cognac

Combine and blend well. Chill. At table, spoon over shrimp salad.

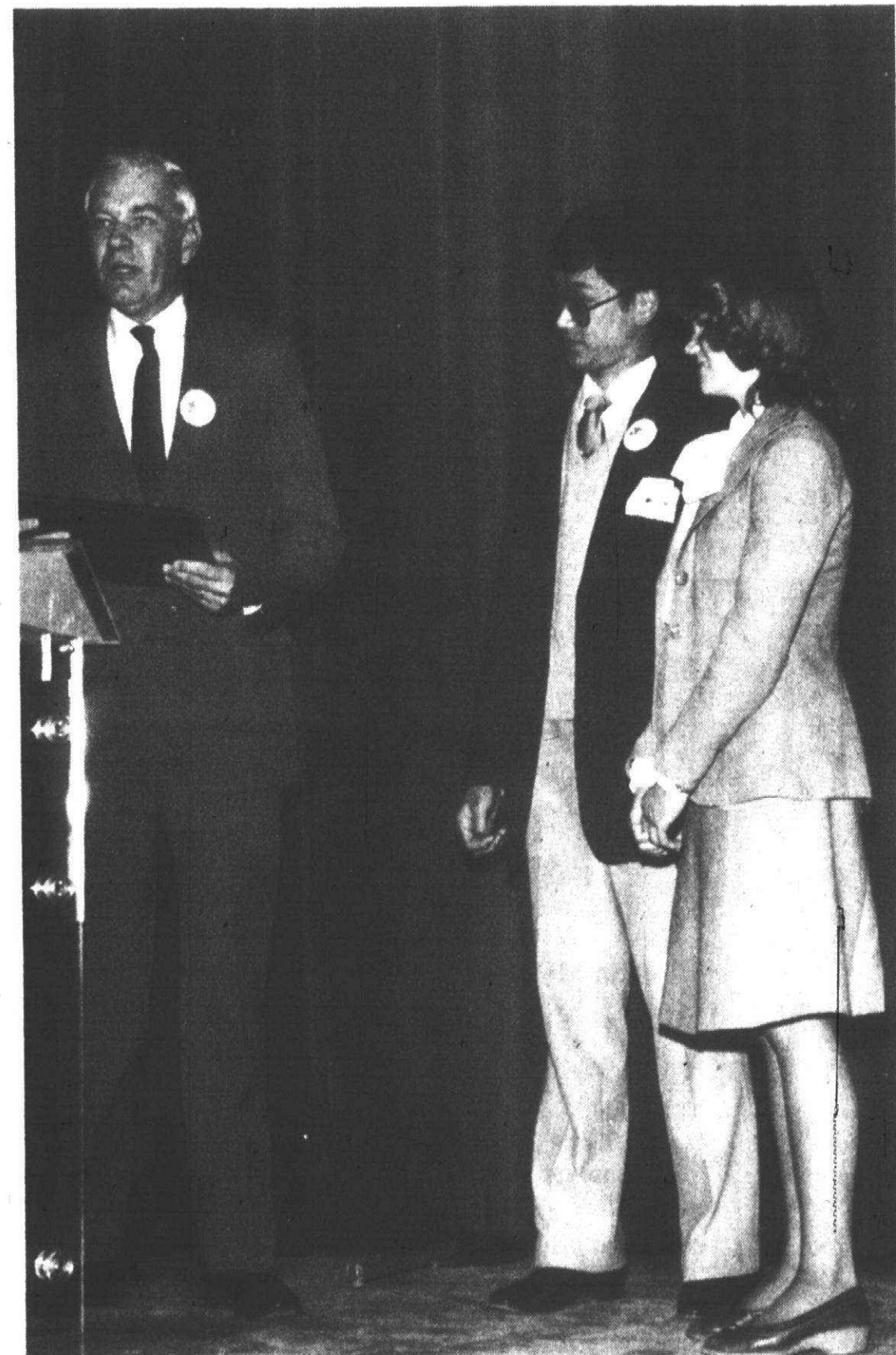

# Chiefs 2 steps away from baseball title

Plymouth Canton took its second straight Class A regional baseball title by storm Saturday at Wyandotte's spacious Memorial Field.

Junior shortstop Don Dombey provided the thunder and senior pitcher Dan Smith added the finishing touches with a bolt of lightning, giving the Chiefs a 6-4 triumph over Monroe.

In the regional semifinals, Canton eliminated Garden City East, 4-0, while Monroe turned back Belleville, 6-2.

Canton, under the coaching of Fred Crissey, will be making its third semifinal appearance. The Chiefs (24-4) will meet Warren Cousino (23-8) on Tuesday at a site not yet determined at press time. Canton is the host team and has the option of choosing the site. Crissey

was leaning toward Fisher Field at the University of Michigan after the regional triumph.

The Chiefs fell behind 4-3 after three innings against Monroe, but that's when Smith, the team's ace, and Dombey got things going.

Smith, making his first appearance on the day, bailed starter Jamie Chilcoff out of trouble in the fourth when he picked off a Trojan runner at second for the final out.

In the bottom of the inning, Canton managed to get two aboard when Fred Rumberger and pinch-hitter Jeff Cousino both singled.

WITH TWO OUTS, Dombey delivered the crushing blow, a monstrous 400-foot shot which cleared the right-center field fence. The smash came off pitcher Kyle Hall, who took the loss.

"It was a nice way to win it," said Crissey. "That was a legitimate 'later.' In Tiger Stadium — that's out. Their third baseman came over to me and said 'what a poke.' You'd rather win it that way."

Crissey wanted to save Smith for the second game. He went with the team's No. 3 hurler, Mike Battaglia, in the opener against East.

And the junior left-hander came through, holding the hot-hitting Panthers to two hits in going the distance.

Chilcoff started the second game, but found himself in trouble and eventually was lifted because of some costly in-field mistakes.

Monroe overcame a 3-0 deficit with four runs in the second. The Trojans loaded the bases and tied the game when third baseman Darren Wiese threw past first, allowing all three

runners to score.

Monroe put two runners on in the fourth on an error and walk. Crissey then called for Smith, who responded by holding the Trojans hitless the rest of the way for his 27th career victory, a school record. The All-Stater was sharp, striking out six in 3½ innings of relief work.

"THIS WAS the whole plan," said Crissey about his pitching arrangement. "This was not off the seat of our pants. Danny (Smith) had to pitch so much last year he ran out of gas, but if we would have played our usual defense, 'Chilly' (Chilcoff), would have gone the whole game."

Crissey is optimistic about reaching the finals, slated to be held Saturday in Mt. Pleasant.

"We're in better shape than we were

last year," he said. "We're going to play on a better field and not some house."

"The difference with this team is that we've been there (the semifinals)."

Canton was ousted year ago by eventual state champ Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher in the semifinals, 4-3. Crissey was critical of last year's semifinal site, Grosse Pointe North, because of its lack of seats and facilities for fans, and also a 280-foot left-field fence.

"I'd just like to get there (the finals)," said the Canton coach, "and I'd like to play at the best facility I can find."

Against Monroe, Rumberger went 3-for-3 and Dombey was 2-for-2. Canton outthit the Trojans, 6-3.

GARDEN CITY EAST put up a gallant bid, but was unable to solve Battaglia, who kept them off balance with breaking balls.

Base-running mistakes and an injury to catcher Bob Booth took its toll on the Panthers.

Second baseman John Bolen, who made several stellar defensive plays, was cut down at the plate in the first

inning trying to stretch a triple into a homer. Two other East runners also were picked off.

Canton got a run in the first off East hurler Mike Krauss when Marty McCarthy singled home Dombey. The Chiefs added another run in the third when Dombey singled, swiped second and third, and crossed home on a wild pitch.

East missed Booth's leadership. He was taken out in the first inning when he reinjured his thumb, and Canton took advantage of his absence to score two more runs.

"That hurts (Booth's injury) because he's handled our pitchers all year long," said East coach Len Bartlo. "But we have no excuses."

"Our team batting average is .311. We just didn't hit the ball. The kid (Battaglia) pitched well. He'll hit the corners, then he'll get the ball over any time he wants. You've got to give credit to the pitcher over there."

Krauss, a junior, allowed only four hits, but walked six and hit two Chiefs. Battaglia walked just two.

# Errors haunt Rocks in regional softball test

Some shabby fielding cost Plymouth Salem's softball team more than a game.

It put a foreclosure on the Rocks' season Saturday as Monroe came away with a 10-1 Class A regional tournament win at Quandt Park in Lincoln Park.

Salem committed seven errors and bowed out with a 16-10 record.

Monroe held a slim 1-0 advantage af-

ter three innings of play, but in the top of the fourth, everything seemed to go wrong for the Rocks.

For openers, third baseman Kelly Strautz dislocated her elbow in a collision and had to leave the game.

During the disastrous fourth, Monroe's Terri Grego made it 2-0 with a sacrifice fly. On the play, Salem right fielder Cheryl Viele fired the ball to plate, but catcher Mary Pryslak cut off the throw, rifling a shot to Strautz at third in an attempt to nail Anne Waller, who was trying to advance from second.

Strautz took the worst of crash and was admitted to a nearby hospital.

When Strautz exited, so did the Rocks' fielding.

Monroe added two more runs in that inning to build a 4-0 cushion. The Trojans kept up the assault in the fifth with another four runs on three hits and four Salem errors.

SALEM COACH Rob Willette had a difficult time explaining his team's mishaps.

"Good question," he said after the game. "I don't know. I think when Kelly Strautz got hurt, everybody just got

down. At that point it was 2-0, and we just fell apart after the injury."

On offense, the Rocks were pestered by windmill pitching of fireballer Jenni Runion, who allowed just three hits, raising her record to 14-4.

The senior righthander lost her bid for a shut-out in the bottom of the sixth.

Pryslak led off with a single, stole second, and came home when Sarah McKenna reached first on an over-throw.

"We were in the game and scored first, and got up," Willette said, "Ev-

erybody's fired up, and they're really ripping the ball."

"But after you get down by a couple, it gets harder to hit."

Diane Murphy, Salem's starting pitcher, the victim of five unearned runs, suffered the loss. She finished the year with a 13-9 record and kept her ERA below 2.00, according to Willette.

"PLYMOUTH SALEM has nothing to be ashamed of," said Monroe coach Vince Rossi, whose team upped its

# Wrestler forms tag team with God

For Luigi Milani, wrestling is much more than physical competition.

He and some buddies are getting together to wrestle for God.

Milani, a former Farmington High

School grappler now rolling on the University of Michigan mats, is among 36 wrestlers and coaches hoping to spread their faith to Latin America.

They represent Athletes-In-Action, a group encompassing various sports with one goal in mind — scoring points by spreading religion.

Wrestlers and coaches nationwide meet today in Orlando, Fla., for nine days of training and getting to know one another. The group will divide into smaller groups.

One group will head to Guatemala and Puerto Rico, while Milani's crew travels to Peru and Panama. The entire ensemble will return home July 15.

MILANI, WHO will wrestle at 149½ pounds for Athletes-In-Action, welcomes the change in uniforms.

"Our main purpose is to share our Christian faith and to show how Christ works in us through athletics," Milani said. "Sports is a huge avenue in order to get through to people. Athletes-In-Action spreads the faith through sports."

"There are other (non-athletic affiliated) groups who go down to Latin America and share their faith alone. Through athletics, you can attract people."

"You watch them on TV and there's a lot of excitement," he said. "Then people will say 'Hey, that kid's really great, what makes him so good?' That will open up a great conversation as to how you perform and why you perform like that."

In Latin America, Milani's group will wrestle both Olympic and national teams, as well as university teams in the vicinity. Last year, a similar AIAA trip attracted 8,000 spectators, Milani said.

"Wrestling is big there, but not as much as in Russia or Japan," Milani said. "They know little about religion."

"It's going to be hard for us. They may be reluctant towards us in some cities, or in others we may find that they're really hungry for the word of God."

"It's possible that their government

— like in Russia, they ban the people from having Bibles — drills into the people's heads what they're going to have," he said. "Then again, they may be happy to greet us."

In his sophomore year at U-M, Milani became involved in Campus Crusade for Christ, whose sports affiliate is Athletes-In-Action.

When he completes his trip, Milani will continue to train for next year's wrestling season at U-M.

Meanwhile, the trip leaves a dent in Milani's wallet. His costs are expected to reach \$3,400, about \$2,000 more than he has.

However, his coaches have given Milani, who had a personal 7-11 record this year as a member of U-M's wrestling team, a 12-month reprieve in which to pay for the trip.

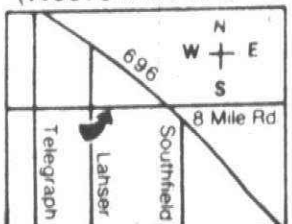

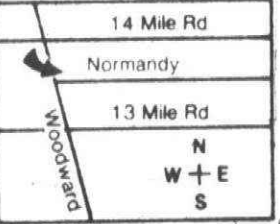

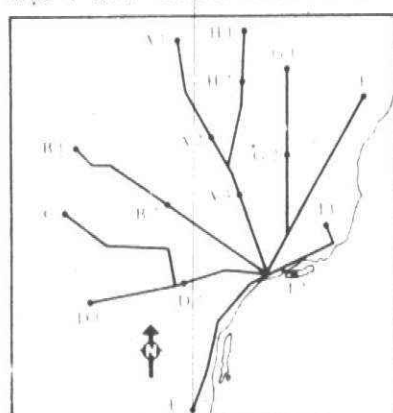

# The kill shot: A destructive offensive weapon

The kill shot is the most effective offensive weapon a racquetball player can command. The receiver has to strain to get low to retrieve it and must always be on his toes, constantly anticipating where, when, how fast, and how low you'll shoot.

Kill shots can be attempted from virtually anywhere on the court. You do, however, have a better chance of killing the ball in the vicinity of the service zone. Your opponent most likely will be behind you and, therefore, farther from the ball. There is also a disadvantage here — it will be more difficult to know which way your opponent is leaning.

There are no definite do's or don'ts regarding where to shoot. There is, however, a good rule to follow: Put the ball where your opponent is not. Even if you're hitting 85 percent of your kills, you're bound to leave some hanging. If your shot is bad but far enough away from your opponent, it still may work as a passing shot.

WHEN ATTEMPTING a kill, the key word is patience. You must let the ball fall below the knees (as low as you can) before hitting. The object is to keep the ball low, from your racquet to the wall, and after that gravity will do the rest.

The basic reason for shooting the ball at a very low point is so the ball will stay low. If you shoot from the hip, for instance, in an attempt to make the ball hit the front wall low, the ball will be moving at such a great angle that it will bounce fairly high. The higher it bounces, the easier it will be for the opponent to retrieve.

Wait, be patient, don't rush, and when the ball is in place, smack it with an open racquet. The more time you wait, the more time you will have to set up for your shot.

Use the time by placing yourself in a stationary position; you can't shoot effectively when you're on the run. Watch the ball closely. Only by studying the velocity and angle of the ball can you determine when to shoot. Wait

until the last possible moment.

THE STANDARD method of kill-shot execution is as follows:

Assume a batter's stance with your lead foot a little closer to the sidewall which you are facing than your back foot. The knees should be more than slightly bent. The torso should be bent so as to assume a position almost over the ball.

The ball should be directly even with the front leg at the time of contact with the racquet, which should begin its motion toward the ball from above the shoulder. The wrist should be slightly

cocked until just before hitting the ball.

In fact, for speed and a hard shot, the wrist should be in the middle of a snap at the same time that the racquet is touching the ball.

A follow-through should be made with your legs, hips and shoulders. This will insure that you are not just swinging with your arm. You also will fare better in case of a complete miss, when your whole body can absorb the unexpected jolt rather than just your elbow.

This procedure is identical for the backhand and forehand kill shot, except for one variation. In the backhand motion, the racquet will begin its de-

scent to the ball from your freehand shoulder, whereas on a forehand kill, the racquet will issue from the vicinity of your racquet-hand shoulder.

THERE ARE no set rules on where and when to attempt a kill shot. It is commonly held that the kill which grazes the sidewall first (reverse corner kill) is the most effective, because the ball will die on the floor after hitting the frontwall. This is the case in one instance, when the ball is hit low enough and grazes slightly enough.

The basic kill shot hit low into the frontwall and quickly wedging into the sidewall is called a straight-in kill.

But the disadvantage to this kill shot is the fact that only a few inches make the difference between a ball that dies and one that rebounds into front center court.

On the other hand, the ball hit

straight into the frontwall without contact with the sidewall can sometimes serve as an effective pass shot when it is not low enough to be considered a kill.

Without a doubt, the most beautiful sight to a racquetball player is that of a ball rolling away from the frontwall. When the ball doesn't bounce, there's no question as to whether the other guy is going to get it or not. Good isn't the word for a rollout, perfect is.

ALTHOUGH rollout kill shots are rather infrequent occurrences, still, they do happen. And since it is the object of the game to make it difficult, if not impossible, for your opponent to shoot easily, the skill shot is No. 1 on any list of shots to perfect. But, like most other things, it is easier said than done. I cannot stress enough the necessity of practice.

## Views On Dental Health

### INFANT'S FIRST HOME CLEANING

Home dental care should really begin before baby has a single tooth. Plaque can form on the gum pads just as it forms on the teeth. While mother cleans her baby from top to bottom every day, she sometimes forgets that juice, formula, cereal, milk and so on, leave debris in the mouth. A piece of gauze can be used to wipe the gums after the last feeding of the day, and this may help to reduce gum inflammation which is especially important as the child begins teething.

Many dentists feel that plaque-caused inflammation of the gums is a factor in teething difficulties, and if plaque is removed regularly, the teething process will be more comfortable. The cleaning, of course, is to be continued after the first teeth appear.

One technique that has been used successfully is for the parents to sit on chairs facing each other, and while one parent supports the legs, the other holds the child's head softly in his or her lap and gently wipes the teeth with gauze from behind the head.

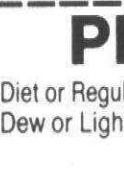

## Human elements, mechanics merge in 'Star Trek II'

When the Federation starship Enterprise is in deep space and the captain or some of the crew want to be transferred to coordinates outside the ship, they go to the transporter room where they are "energized."

"Star Trek II: The Wrath of Khan" (PG) is totally energized. It transports the viewer to a visually dazzling experience. The movie is a crisp choreography of computer graphics, electronic effects and optical magic that does not neglect the human element.

The inside jokes, familiar arguments and tongue-in-cheek word play among the characters were an important part of the original television series and are just as important in the movie.

The script, combining rapid-fire action with interesting characters and content, was written by Jack B. Sowards and directed by Nicholas Meyers with unflagging vitality.

**THE ENTIRE CREW** is back for this sequel: William Shatner as Admiral Kirk (he's been promoted), Leonard Nimoy as Spock, DeForest Kelley as Leonard "Bones" McCoy, Walter Koenig as Chekhov, James Doohan as Scotty, Nichelle Nichols as Uhura and George Takei as Sulu.

New among these familiar faces is Paul Winfield who gives a fine performance as Officer Terrell and Kirstie Alley as a lieutenant in training. She is a Vulcan, like Spock, and displays some of the same characteristics.

"Star Trek II" is a cosmos away in adventure and excitement from the relatively tame first Star Trek movie. Even the costumes are bolder, more dashing, and the control room is more exciting than a roomful of video games.

In fairness to the first movie, however, I did find its ending more provocative. "Star Trek II" hews to a simple "search and destroy" scenario.

Kirk is aboard the Enterprise observing a training mission for a crew of new cadets when the ship is engaged in battle by an old enemy, Khan (Ricardo Montalban). Khan, who had been banished to an uninhabited planet by Kirk, has managed to obtain a Federation ship and is now after vengeance. He seeks the death of Kirk and the destruction of the Enterprise.

AS HE ATTEMPTS to wreck his vengeance, he also manages to gain control of the Genesis project. Genesis is an experimental project to create life from inorganic matter.

Montalban plays the villain Khan with a juicy viciousness that makes him a worthy adversary for Kirk and crew. Also appearing in this movie is Carol (Bibi Besch), Kirk's love of long ago, and her son, David (Merritt Buttrick).

As if these entanglements and subplots aren't enough for one movie, there is also a nasty bit of torture that might have come straight out of "Alien" and a running joke about the proper solution to a training exercise that programs a no-win situation.

The conclusion of "Star Trek II" sets up the possibility for a "Star Trek III." As one who has seen the television series over and over and still finds the episodes interesting, I hope the movies will be able to maintain that same high quality which balanced the excitement of exploring outer space with the intellectual excitement of probing inner space — our values and ethics.

As Spock would say, "It is the only logical thing to do."
