## Kirchgatter, McClendon win school race

### Voter turnout helps incumbent

A heavy turnout of voters from Plymouth and Plymouth Township was one of the deciding factors in Monday's school election.

That turnout helped elect incumbent Elaine Kirchgatter and former trustee E.J. McClendon and boosted challenger Roland Thomas to the third spot.

Another factor was the large number of challengers who took away votes from each other.

Monday saw a small turnout of registered voters as only 7 percent

### analysis

(3,115) of the district's 44,000 electors went to the polls.

**PRECINCTS THAT** totally or predominantly consist of Plymouth/Plymouth Township voters had a turnout of 26 percent while precincts which totally or predominantly consist of Canton residents had a turnout of 18 percent.

The fact that twice as many Plymouth residents as Canton residents went to the polls Monday helped McClendon of Plymouth Township, Thomas of Plymouth, and Kirchgatter who lives in Canton but is active in many organizations in Plymouth.

Of the 10 candidates, Kirchgatter placed first with 1,220 votes followed by McClendon with 1,147. Both will serve four-year terms.

**THOMAS RAN** a strong third with 1,003 and may be considered as an appointee to the board should a vacancy occur.

After Thomas, the results dropped off sharply with Lynn Hoehn of Plymouth finishing fourth with 662 votes, Marilyn Rickard of Canton fifth with

### Winners support different views

Elaine Kirchgatter offers continuity with no significant changes in school-district policies, while E.J. McClendon wants to re-evaluate curriculum objectives for a quality education and improve resident involvement in handling discipline problems that face the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

These contrasting views will be part of the Board of Education for the next four years.

Kirchgatter, an incumbent, and McClendon, who has served on the board before, finished first and second, respectively, in Monday's school election. McClendon, who was on the board from 1974-78, replaces President Carol Davis, who did not seek re-election.

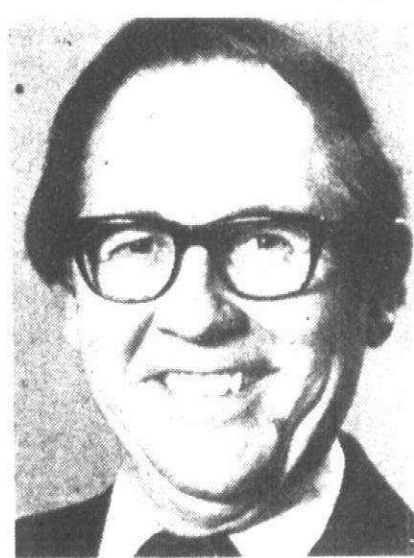
**KIRCHGATTER OF** Canton says not to expect anything different from her in the next four years. She will continue to make a balanced budget her top priority. She believes in supporting all programs and continuing present services — even if it means asking voters for a tax increase to pay for the activities.

Kirchgatter also defends the school administration. The community should be aware of the fortunate financial position of the school district,

despite a \$2-million deficit on a \$41-million budget, she said. Kirchgatter gives credit to the school administration's business staff for making good financial decisions for the district.

## Westland cop ousts 16-year incumbent from board

Dewey Combs, making his first bid for public office, defeated Thomas Barrett, who has served four terms and nearly 16 years, Monday for a seat on the Wayne/Westland school board.

Combs garnered 4,115 votes to 3,428 for Barrett. Combs won 19 of the 23 precincts. About 13.5 percent of 56,000 registered voters in the school district participated.

Combs, a lieutenant in Westland's Police Department, will begin his four-year term July 1.

"It tells me that the working people want to be heard," said a jubilant Combs at a crowded post-election party. "These are the people who worked for me. These are the people I told you who couldn't get questions answered down there. They're going to be heard now."

Barrett, a teacher in the Dearborn School District, said he may have been hurt, as an incumbent, by changing moods of the electorate.

"People feel frustrated, angry at things in general, and local officials are accessible," Barrett said.

"We have nothing to be ashamed of,"

he said. "We did what we thought was right. People are indicating they want a change, I guess. We had a lot of good people, a lot of good votes. We made a good try to see if we could keep the school district as good as it's been."

"I CAN'T honestly say what this vote will mean for the future," Barrett said. "I'm afraid some of the divisiveness is going to make the job tougher."

Combs also agreed almost any incumbent on the board would have had

trouble in this year's election.

"I don't think it's a protest of Mr. Barrett, but taxes and things people are burdened with yet," Combs said.

He said he plans to spend the next few weeks familiarizing himself with the fine points of school district operations.

"I'll just have to go over there and find out what's going on and make my voice heard," Combs said. "I'm floating. It's wonderful."

During the campaign, Combs was highly critical of a proposed community college for the district and a teacher's contract approved well in advance

of its expiration date calling for wage increases up to 9 percent.

Barrett cited his years of service building a highly regarded district.

Timothy J. Dyer, superintendent of schools, said he couldn't comment on the results until he had a chance to analyze the returns.

"WE'LL BE HAPPY to work with Mr. Combs, and like we've always said, what the people say, we'll abide by it," Dyer said.

## More elderly hit by shady repair workers

Canton senior citizens continue to be victimized by phony or questionable itinerant home-improvement workers.

Last week, two elderly persons filed police reports after experiences with men who showed up at their homes, offering to spray a protective material on the roof.

The residents paid hundreds of dollars for the job, with no written contract. The workers demanded payment in cash, then drove off.

If the roofing material washes away after a rainfall, it's tough luck for the homeowner. The workers are long gone.

Last month, an 84-year-old Canton man was fleeced of \$1,200 by fast-talking men. First, they tried to get hired for roof and gutter work. When that failed, one distracted the elderly man, while another went into the house and stole the money, according to a report.

Unscrupulous, itinerant home-repair workers are an "an age-old problem," said Catharine Coraci, director of community affairs for the Better Business Bureau of Metropoli-

tan Detroit.

"We aren't talking about legitimate home remodeling firms," she added. "We're talking about the ones who just show up in a neighborhood. They are just taking advantage of people. You have to be careful of what they are offering you."

In recent weeks, the Canton police department has logged at least four complaints about itinerant home repairmen who may be intimidating, pressuring or tricking elderly residents.

The recent rash of complaints has prompted Police Chief Jerry Cox to issue a warning letter to senior citizens and residents in the Neighborhood Watch crime-prevention program.

**THE SUSPECTS** show up at a home, offering to seal driveways or roofs, said Cox. They often work in pairs traveling in pickup trucks. Often they are accompanied by children and women.

Sometimes one member of the team keeps the victim distracted, while another ransacks the house and takes what-

ever money or goods he can find, according to police.

Elderly are frequent targets because they can be intimidated through fear and physical limitations, said Coraci. They also are home during the day, when the itinerants are looking for business.

"It isn't unusual to case (check in advance) a neighborhood," Coraci added.

Residential home-repair firms must be licensed by the state, said Coraci. Persons should call the department of licensing and regulation at 962-7566 before agreeing to the work.

"Always have a contract, with a name, address and phone number," she added. "Think about it overnight. If they want to do the work right now, be leery. Don't give a deposit. Don't give money."

**CANTON'S MOST** recent cases occurred June 3, said police Cpl. Rob Cripe, who is handling the case.

According to police reports, two men in their 20s were traveling in a silver or gray pickup truck, accompanied by a

boy about 10 years old. The men are described in their 20s, with black hair, brown eyes and a dark complexion.

In the first case, a 78-year-old woman agreed to let the men spray the roof of her Ford Road house. She thought she was dealing with roofers hired by her daughter.

Payment of \$1,600 was demanded in cash. The men waited while the woman went to the bank, for the money. The daughter called police.

**NEXT**, A Sheldon Road resident was approached by two men who offered to "demonstrate" a spray roofing process, then demanded cash payment of about \$700. They finally settled for \$466, said Cripe.

Cox warns residents to refuse any unsolicited offers of work, and to refuse entry into the house. In addition, residents should not accept any samples.

These persons shouldn't be left alone.

## Cop fires gun, 1 man escapes

## Police nab man in home break-in

Canton police have charged one man, and are seeking another in connection with a home break-in early Saturday.

The incident, which began on Oakbrook, sparked a short police chase, a gun confrontation and an unsuccessful search with tracking dogs.

Police have charged Anthony Terrana, 30, of Newport, north of Monroe, with breaking-and-entering a home. They have a warrant for the arrest of Karl Dushane, 33, of River Rouge.

**ACCORDING TO** Lt. Larry Stewart, officers John MacDiarmid and Davey LeBlanc were investigating a report of a suspicious car shortly before 2 a.m. Saturday. The car, with keys in the ignition, was parked on Oakbrook.

The officers saw persons carrying items from an Oakbrook house to the car, said Stewart. The officers followed the car, waiting for marked police vehicles to arrive.

MacDiarmid and LeBlanc chased the car a short distance, to Joy Road east of Holly. The driver of the car got out with a shotgun in his hand, said Stewart.

MacDiarmid fired one round from his handgun, identifying himself as a police officer, according to Stewart. The man, who wasn't hit, tossed down his shotgun and ran into a heavily wooded area.

**TWO CANTON** police dogs, hampered by several police cars, officers and residents, failed to pick up the track of the man who ran away, said Stewart.

"We tried (tracking) for a number of hours," said Stewart. "We destroyed the track. It was our fault. We ruined it."

Terrana, who was arrested at the scene, was arraigned last weekend at the out-county branch of the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office on a charge of breaking-and-entering the Oakbrook home. Items reported stolen were a TV, stereo speakers and assorted jewelry.

The court entered a plea of innocent in Terrana's behalf. He was sent to Wayne County Jail in lieu of \$25,000 bond. Preliminary examination in 35th District Court will be June 21.

Breaking-and-entering carries a maximum penalty of 15 years in prison upon conviction.

# Officials mull charges against 3 teen vandals

Three Plymouth youths have admitted to vandalizing Starkweather Elementary School two weeks ago.

The teenagers, who have signed statements, are also believed to be involved in the recent Central Middle School break-in.

The Starkweather break-in has been the focus of a police investigation and \$1,000 reward program for information about possible suspects.

School officials found Starkweather extensively vandalized early Monday morning, June 7. A phone tip lead police to the three youths last Friday.

The youths were identified as two 13-year-old Our Lady of Good Counsel students and one 14-year-old non-student previously involved in the juvenile correction system. They told police the break-in occurred on Saturday, June 5.

School officials had earlier stated the building was checked and found in good order both Saturday and Sunday afternoons.

School Superintendent John Hoben says it is a case of someone not performing the checks as they should have been done. School officials said they are currently checking into the contradiction.

Meanwhile, it is uncertain if the youth will be prosecuted. The schools and Plymouth police department are working together on an alternative.

Hoben says the schools are interested in getting restitution for the \$15,000 worth of damages while Police Chief Carl Berry is leery of what would be done in juvenile court.

"If nothing were to happen in juvenile court, I'm worried about the impact of that," says Berry.

Berry hopes to work with the parents, schools and youths in developing a plan which will pay for the damages while also providing some positive correction for the youths.

"We have reason to believe the parents are cooperating. It is up to the school on the restitution," he says.

The unidentified Plymouth resident who called in the phone tip (the only one received) will receive the promised \$1,000 in cash for the tip, according to City Manager Henry Graper.

"The one tip was completely correct and true. We didn't have people calling in just trying to get the money," he said.

Berry said police weren't certain of any motive for the vandalism at this time.

Police also were able to recover a majority of the items stolen from the school building.

"Mr. Barrett is an excellent board member," Dyer added. "I'm sorry for him after how he has helped build a great school district."

Rose Mary Miller, chairwoman of Taxpayers United Together, a group spearheading a recall drive against board members Donald Rusnock, Kenneth Marshall, Mary Arbour and Mildred Batterson, said Combs' election should add momentum to that campaign.

"I think it's going to make them realize people out there are going to pay attention," Miller said. "They care about the district, what's best for the kids and what's best for themselves."

"I think it was the people against the administration — I think that's what this election boiled down to," she added.

COMBS ALSO agreed his election will have an impact on the recall campaign. "People know they can do what they set out to do," he said.

Barrett, however, sees things differently.

"I think the results are close enough so you can't read a positive result either way," Barrett said. "If there had been a larger margin for either candidate, it would be a barometer for recall."

Barrett also said he stands solidly in the corner of the four board members facing recall. "They're good friends, and I'm concerned about what's best for the community," he said.

The recall election has been scheduled for Sept. 14.

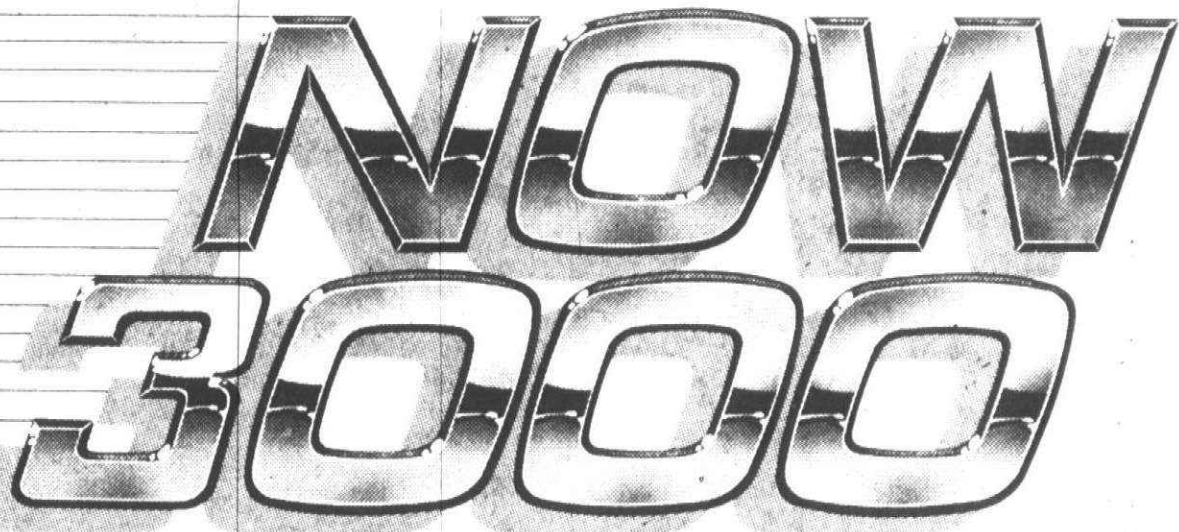

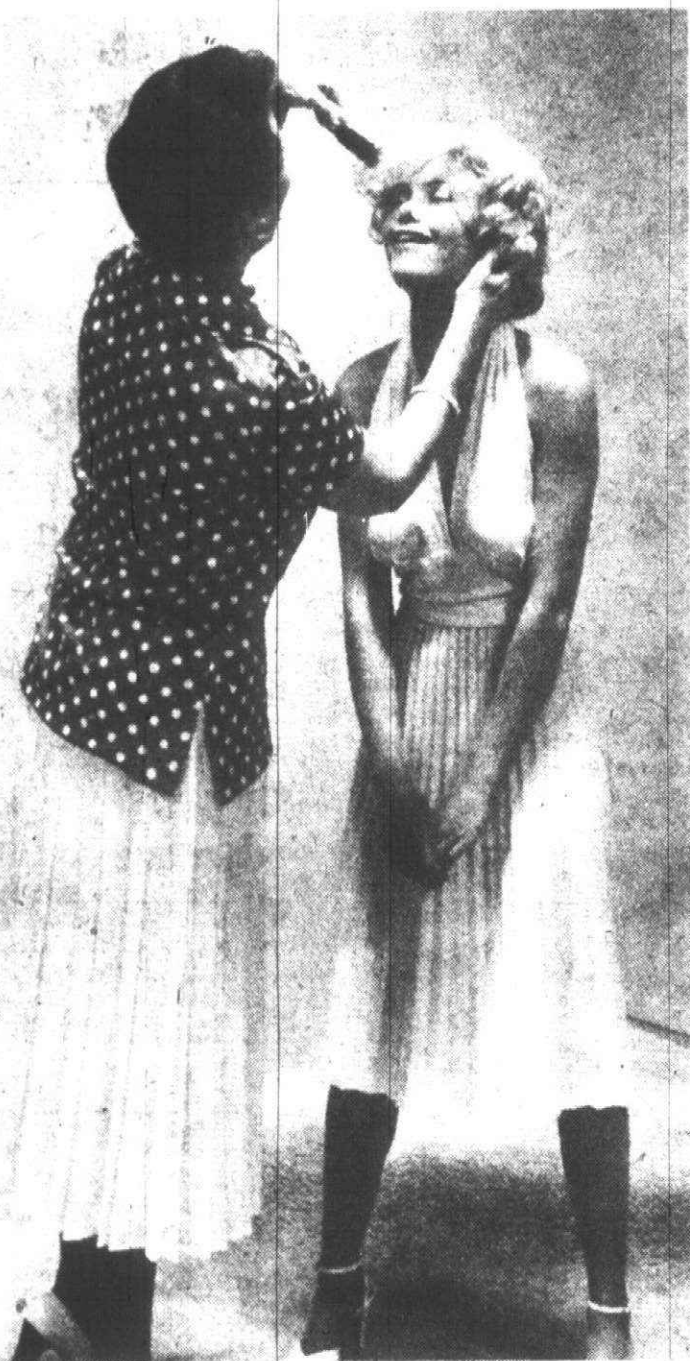
Wayne Willingham, an entertainer at the Mayflower Hotel, Plymouth, also was a featured guest with the look-a-likes.

## Here's the roundup of candidates for elective offices

Tuesday was the filing deadline for candidates seeking election for the Michigan Senate, Michigan House, Wayne County Commission and U.S. Congress.

Three persons have filed for the Senate's 6th district, which includes the cities of Plymouth, Livonia and Northville, and the townships of Plymouth, Canton, Northville and the western portion of portion of Redford.

Noel D. Culbert of Canton, a former Canton supervisor, is the only Democrat seeking the 6th District's Senate seat.

Incumbent state Sen. Robert Geake of Northville, and newcomer Norman Kinzel of Northville Township, are the Republicans running for the Senate seat.

Four persons have filed for the state representative's seat in the newly-created 36th district which includes the cities of Plymouth and Northville and the townships of Plymouth, Northville and northeast portion of Canton.

County Commissioner William Joyner of Plymouth is the only Democrat seeking the 36th District House seat.

The Republicans seeking the 36th seat are Open Door Church minister Ronald Fisher of Northville Township, Plymouth Township Trustee Gerald Law and University of Michigan-Dearborn economic professor Gary Wolfman of Canton.

Five persons have filed for the state

representative's seat in the 37th District which includes the cities of Belleville, Romulus and Wayne, and the townships of Van Buren and southwestern portion of Canton.

Running as Democrats in the 37th District are incumbent Rep. Edward Mahalak of Romulus, Wayne County Sheriff's Deputy Betty Jo Price of Belleville, Canton Township planner Jim Kosteva and attorney Roger Cadaret of Romulus.

The only Republican running in the 37th District is Theodore Jacques of Romulus.

**ELEVEN PERSONS** have filed for the 11th Wayne County Commission District which includes the cities of Belleville, Romulus, Wayne and the

western part of Westland, and the townships of Canton, Sumpter, Huron and Van Buren.

The Democrats seeking the 11th District county seat are: Margaret Leduc of Romulus, J. B. Boroff of Wayne, Douglas Ritter of Canton, Robert Smith of Belleville, Edward D'Angelo of Belleville, Leonard Wisniewski of Rockwood, Gary Bates of New Boston, Berna Chenault of Sumpter and Milton Mack Jr. of Wayne.

The Republicans seeking the same seat are Darrell Kress of Belleville and Loren Bennett of Canton.

Four persons have filed for election in the 10th Wayne County Commission District which includes the cities of Plymouth, Northville and Livonia, and

the townships of Plymouth and Northville.

The Democrats seeking the 10th District county seat are William Ryan of Livonia and Walter Roesler of Livonia.

The Republicans seeking the same county seat are Barry Sherman of Livonia and incumbent Mary Dumas of Livonia.

**THREE PERSONS** have filed for election in the 2nd U.S. Congressional District which includes the cities of Plymouth, Northville and Livonia, the townships of Plymouth and Northville along with parts of Washtenaw and Monroe counties and all of Jackson, Hillsdale and Lenawee counties.

The Democrat seeking the 2nd U.S. congressional seat is former Ann Arbor

councillan and state representative George Wahr Sallade of Ann Arbor.

The Republicans seeking the same U.S. seat are incumbent Rep. Carl Pursell of Plymouth and Walter B. Long of Jackson.

Four persons have filed for election to the 15th U.S. Congressional district which includes Canton and the cities of Westland, Taylor, Dearborn Heights and other downriver communities.

The Democrats seeking the 15th district seat are incumbent Rep. William D. Ford of Taylor and Gerald Carlson of Wayne, who ran as a Republican against Ford two years ago.

The Republicans seeking the same seat are Glen Kassel of Westland and Mitchell Moran of Taylor.

## Principals play musical chairs

A shuffle of middle school principals was approved Monday night by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The shifts were prompted by the decision of Gerald Elston, principal at Pioneer Middle, to step down from the administrative ranks and return to teaching for a year before retiring.

That decision spurred a series of transfers which involves East Principal Carl Taylor being assigned as principal of Pioneer and Central Middle principal Gus Gorguza being named principal at East Middle.

Greg Owens, assistant principal at Central, was promoted Monday night to principal by the school board and then assigned to the principalship at Central.

Patricia Moore, assistant principal at Pioneer, was re-assigned as assistant principal at Central Middle replacing Owens.

Within the next two weeks, Superintendent John M. Hoben is expected to recommend someone for the assistant principal's position at Pioneer.

The changes involve all middle school principals except Robert Smith at West Middle and Gary Faber at Lowell Middle.

Trustee Tom Yack had suggested that now might be a time to consider transferring Smith as he had been at West for many years. In the past, added Yack, it was felt a change in assignment would be helpful to a person who had been in one spot for a long time.

Hoben said the administrative cabinet and executive cabinet discussed moving Smith to Pioneer and

to East but decided that the best changes would involve Taylor, Gorguza, Moore and Owens.

In making the decision, added Hoben, the executive cabinet considered the assistant and staff at each middle school and the leadership style of each principal and tried for the best match.

Yack commented that once these changes were completed, it likely would be many years before middle school principals are changed again and so Smith may lose out on the opportunity for a transfer.

Hoben suggested there may be more middle school changes within a couple years.

Trustee Flossie Tonda commented that many people in the community felt Gorguza should have been given the job of principal at Pioneer.

## Oakwood sponsors 'survivors' program

Approximately 30 suicides occur in Wayne County each month. Family members and friends who lose a loved one through such a tragedy often experience intense feelings of depression, anger and rejection after the event.

The Oakwood Hospital Canton Center will sponsor a free "Survivors of Suicide" program to provide support and counseling to those who have lost someone through suicide.

The meetings will be 7-9 p.m. every Monday, starting June 21, at 7300 Canton Center Road, at the corner of Warren. The number of meetings will depend upon response and need.

"We are making space available, when practical, to groups who meet the health needs of the community," said David Ippel, assistant administrator for Ambulatory Care at Oakwood and administrator of the Canton Center.

Besides pointing to medical needs, Ippel said health needs also encompass areas such as a person's social and psychological needs, as well. "We are looking at health as a very comprehensive type of word," he added.

By sharing with a group of people who have gone through a similar situation, members can get support and make positive emotional adjustments. Survivors

also can deal with problems such as legal questions, financial issues and problems with child survivors. All group discussions are strictly confidential.

The meetings will be conducted by Mary Leonhardi, coordinator of the program, and Rick Pancioli, guidance counselor.

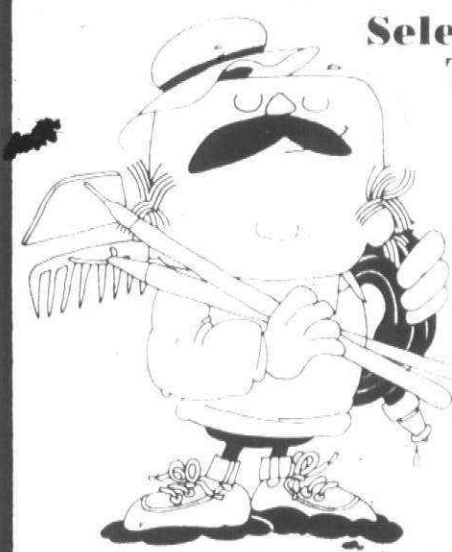

Canton trustee Loren Bennett has entered the race for Wayne County commissioner in the new 11th District.

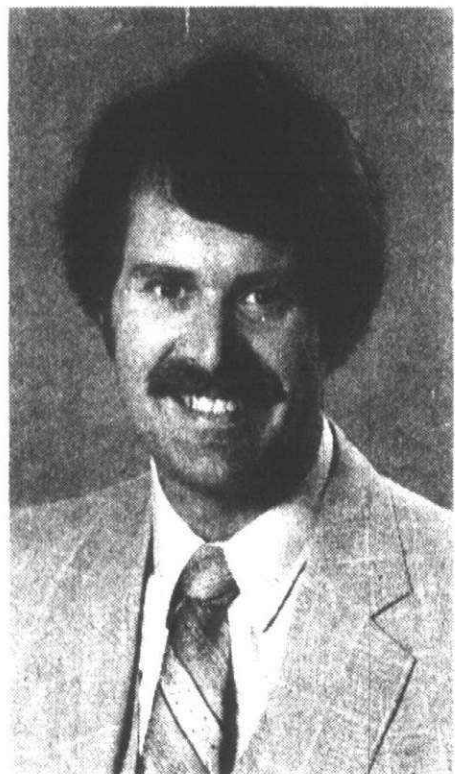
Bennett, 31, is in the middle of a four-year term on the Canton Township Board — his first public office.

568 votes, and David Artley of Canton sixth with 486 votes.

Other finishers were Ernie Rumsby of Canton with 216 votes, followed by Janet Draper with 176, Rodney Hosman with 142, and Arthur Leib with 116.

Last year, Rickard finished third in a field of eight candidates when William Decker defeated incumbent Steve Harper. Rumsby ran fifth in last year's school election.

GENERALLY, VOTES for an incumbent and former incumbent would be viewed as an expression by the electorate of satisfaction with the operation of the school district.

Likewise it is generally viewed that election of a challenger suggests residents are unhappy with the school board or district.

Some will see Monday's results as a vote of confidence for the school board

## analysis

as Kirchgatter/McClendon gained a total of 2,367 votes or 41 percent of the 5,736 votes cast compared to 29 percent of the total gathered by the two closest challengers — Thomas and Hoehn.

OTHERS, HOWEVER, will note that the four serious challengers (Thomas, Hoehn, Rickard, Artley) collected 2,719 votes or 47 percent of the total — a stronger performance than the two winners.

The final results do suggest that challengers were taking away votes from each other which otherwise would have changed the outcome.

A look at the precinct results indicate that Hoehn took away votes from

Thomas as she ran fourth in four of the five precincts in which Thomas ran third.

McCLENDON PLACED first in six precincts (Central, Starkweather, Allen, Farrand, Fiegel and Eriksson) while Kirchgatter finished first in five precincts (Isbister, Miller, Hulsing, Plymouth Canton High, and the absentee voter counting board).

Thomas placed first at Gallimore, West and Bird precincts.

In seven of the 14 precincts, plus absentees, Kirchgatter and McClendon were the top two finishers.

Thomas placed second at Fiegel, Miller and Hulsing, and third at Central, Isbister, Allen, Farrand and

amongst the absentees.

KIRCHGATTER RAN second at Central, Gallimore, Starkweather, Allen, West, Farrand, Field, and Bird and ran third at Fiegel. McClendon placed second at Isbister, Canton High and among the absentees and ran third at West, Miller, Field and Bird.

Rickard ran strong in three Canton precincts plus Allen; Hoehn ran strong in five Plymouth precincts and two Canton; and Artley ran strong in four Canton precincts and in a fifth (Fiegel) which includes a large number of Canton voters.

Districtwide, Canton has more residents than Plymouth Township or Plymouth. Canton often affects the outcome of elections but usually when the voter turnout is larger. Last year, as an example, there was a larger voter turnout because of a millage proposal on the ballot and Canton residents ran much higher in the standings.

# Board candidates weigh election outcome

McCLENDON, who served as board president in 1974-75 and 1975-76, did not run a vigorous campaign. He said he wanted residents to vote for him based on his past performance as a school board member.

"I'm grateful to those people who showed confidence in me for what I stand for," McClendon said. "As I said before, I'm the same person — no different beliefs, no different values.

"The problems are different, and there may be different responses, but I'm the same person."

McClendon's first goal is to try to maintain a quality education within financial restrictions, the Plymouth Township resident said.

THE PRESENT board has been willing to continue to cut — but not eliminate — programs. McClendon is willing to concede a program's usefulness, but isn't afraid to "let it go" if it doesn't fit in the budget, he said.

Can McClendon convince the board to accept his philosophy?

"That's the \$64 question that I don't have an answer to."

NEWCOMERS ROLAND Thomas and Lynne Hoehn, both of Plymouth, finished third and fourth, respectively. Thomas was one of the hardest campaigners in this election, while Hoehn hardly campaigned at all.

Both candidates advocate changes in the school district and say they will remain active in school committees and activities.


Hoehn and Thomas disagree on the analysis of the election results, however. Hoehn believes the results were a strong indication that residents like the way the district is managed

Thomas believes more residents want change, rather than the status quo, but too many candidates and a low-voter turnout helped the winners.

"THERE WERE too many people (candidates) spread too thin," Thomas said. "I think if you had a millage on the ballot, you would have seen more voters and some changes.

Approximately seven percent of the 44,000 registered voters in the school district went to the polls Monday to select two persons from a 10-candidate field.





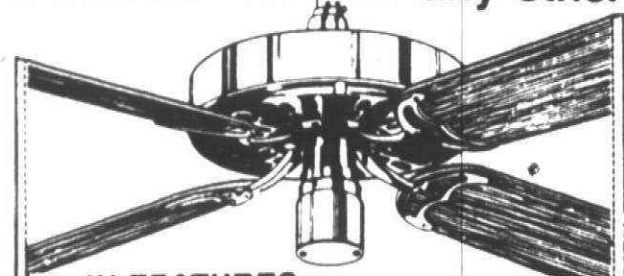

# Technicians upgrade skills

The technicians help students overcome peer pressures, making good commitments, taking the risk to set new behavior patterns, helping them meet class objectives, and helping solve day-to-day problems.

The teacher and technician work as a team to provide this service in areas such as auto body, auto mechanics, building trades, commercial foods, vocational design, clerical/secretarial lab, cosmetology, retailing, child care, and health occupations.

# 124 sign petition 'Grote Building' resisted at SC

Former President C. Nelson Grote was a hot topic at Monday's special meeting of the Schoolcraft Board of Trustees.

For nearly an hour, trustees Nancie Blatt and Harry Greenleaf crossed swords with Rosina Raymond and Mike Burley on whether Grote should be nominated to have the school's technical building named for him.

The nomination request was made by Blatt, who wanted to honor Grote for his expansion of the school's vocational-technical curriculum.

RAYMOND ARGUED she did not dislike Grote, but believed the process to name a building for him was done too hastily. She asked that it be postponed several months for more consideration.

A faculty union member presented a petition with 124 signatures of faculty and other employees opposing naming a building after Grote. His nomination was finally accepted.

Grote was president of Schoolcraft from 1971-81. He left to become president of a community college system in Spokane, Wash.

During his 10 years, there were two faculty strikes and one secretaries work stoppage. Faculty union spokesmen frequently criticized Grote organization plans and budget priorities.

Grote was Schoolcraft's second president. The first, Eric Bradner, had the library named for him after his retirement.

BLATT REQUESTED that the nomination be discussed Monday so it could be voted on during the next regular business meeting June 23. She is resigning at the end of July and wanted to vote on his nomination.

"It's so obvious what you're trying to do," Blatt said to trustees who she claimed were blocking her nomination.

"When you know a person for 10 years, it isn't hasty to name a building after him," she said.

Trustee Rosina Raymond wanted the nominations postponed. She argued that since Grote hadn't been gone from the college for several years, and since trustees hadn't had 30 days to ponder the nomination, the action was "hurried."

"We've got to think of the college and that we other trustees will be here long after another (Blatt) is gone," Raymond argued. "We are rushing into this, and it isn't right."

Board chairman Harry Greenleaf disagreed.

"We're not acting precipitously. The former president announced his departure last March. We've concerned ourselves with the question (to name the

building) since last fall. This process can't be considered hurried," he said.

ROGER SUTHERLAND, a 19-year Schoolcraft faculty member, presented the board petitions that, he said, contained signatures of faculty, secretaries and clerical workers opposing the building named for Grote.

"I think it (naming the building for Grote) would have a detrimental effect on the faculty. There's a real spirit building on this campus, and I didn't sense that when Dr. Grote was here," Sutherland said.

"As far as the technical building is concerned, many of these programs were already here. The growth in the program reflects the economic times," he added.

Former trustee Gerald Cox supported Grote's nomination, which will be discussed at the board's June 23 meeting.

## 3 business students are winners in contest

Three business education students from Centennial Educational Park (CEP) were among 20 high-school students who were winners at the 23rd annual Metropolitan Detroit Short-hand-Typing Contest.

Donna Hayes of Plymouth Canton High School took dictation at the rate of 28.8 words per minute of 94.1 percent accuracy. She was awarded a portable standard typewriter for placing second in the shorthand contest.

Plymouth Salem's Mary Cooney placed fifth in the shorthand contest

with 28.8 words per minute and 90.6 percent accuracy. She received a hair dryer.

Charlotte Thomas of Canton received a cassette tape recorder for placing third in the typing contest by typing 73 words per minute.

Approximately 140 business education students, representing more than 65 area high schools, competed for prizes.

The contest was sponsored by the Detroit Business Institute for the 13th consecutive year.

Orchestra to be offered after school

An elementary strings program and middle school orchestra will be offered next year — both after school.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education approved a plan Monday night to allow continuation of orchestra for grades 6-9 and to provide a beginning orchestra program for grades 3-6.

The elementary strings program will run from mid-September to mid-June and will be offered through the community education department directed by Larry Masteller.

The instruction will be offered after-

school for a fee of about \$25 for the 30 weeks. The \$25 fee will cover the cost of teachers' salaries and overhead.

Trustee Tom Yack commented that the \$25 was very reasonable as it amounted to about 40 cents an hour compared to about \$8 an hour charged for piano lessons by private tutors.

Mike Homes, assistant superintendent for instruction, agreed but added the student still will have the expense of renting his/her instrument.

Transportation will be the responsibility of the parent, Homes added who described the program as a voluntary approach to allow elementary pupils to participate in an orchestra program.

The instruction will be provided for one hour twice a week.

The middle school orchestra also will meet after school but there will be no fee involved and students will be bused from their school to the building where the instruction is provided.

Parents will be responsible to pick up students after the instruction is over, Homes said.

Homes said the district now has five orchestra instructors at the middle school level. By consolidating the instruction at one center, after school, the district likely won't have to use all five for orchestra.

The approach allows continuation of the middle school orchestras, stressed Homes, but eliminates lost instructional time caused by instructors traveling between buildings during the school day.

The plan also avoids the need to eliminate middle school orchestra because of budget restraints, he added.

There are now more than 50 students currently in the sixth grade participating in the orchestra and almost all have indicated they will continue next year.

Trustee Tom Yack asked for a more exact estimate of cost savings. He indicated it would be better to offer orchestra during the school day and that should be done if the dollar savings is only \$2,000 or less.

Homes said that can be determined once the school is selected and more exact busing costs are developed.

There will be no charge for the middle school instruction.

Police arrest 2 on break-in rap

Two Canton men are scheduled for a preliminary examination in District Court today in connection with the break-in of a storage shed last week.

According to police Cpl. Rob Cripe, three motorcycles valued at \$3,000 were reported stolen from a storage shed on Bannockburn. The theft was reported June 5.

Eric McQueen, 22, of Gordon, and Kenneth Myers, 17, of Canterbury, were arraigned separately last week before 35th District Court Judge James Garber. They are charged with breaking-and-entering an unoccupied dwelling.

THE COURT entered innocent pleas in their behalf. Bond for McQueen was set at \$1,600. Myers was released on personal bond.

All three motorcycles were recovered, said Cripe.

One motorcycle was found in the garage of a home on Hanford, a short distance from the Bannockburn location, according to the police report. A witness reported seeing a fence knocked down, and drag marks leading to the Hanford house, said Cripe.

Penalty for conviction of breaking-and-entering an unoccupied dwelling is 10 years in prison.

Township gets videotape tools

Plymouth Township government is becoming ultra-modern as it now boasts one of the latest model videotape cameras and a large screen.

It is for the use of trustees, planning and zoning commissioners when problems arise.

"We plan to have each section of the township on tape," explained Supervi-

sor Maurice Breen, "and this will save a lot of travel and study to the actual site when problems arise."

"We can show each section in the greatest minute detail, and it should be even better than a trip to the site. It will save travel, help to solve problems, and will be well worth the \$6,400 it cost."

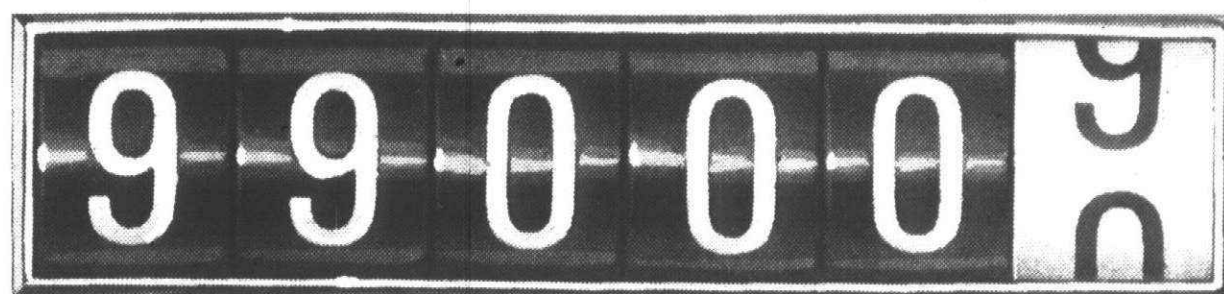

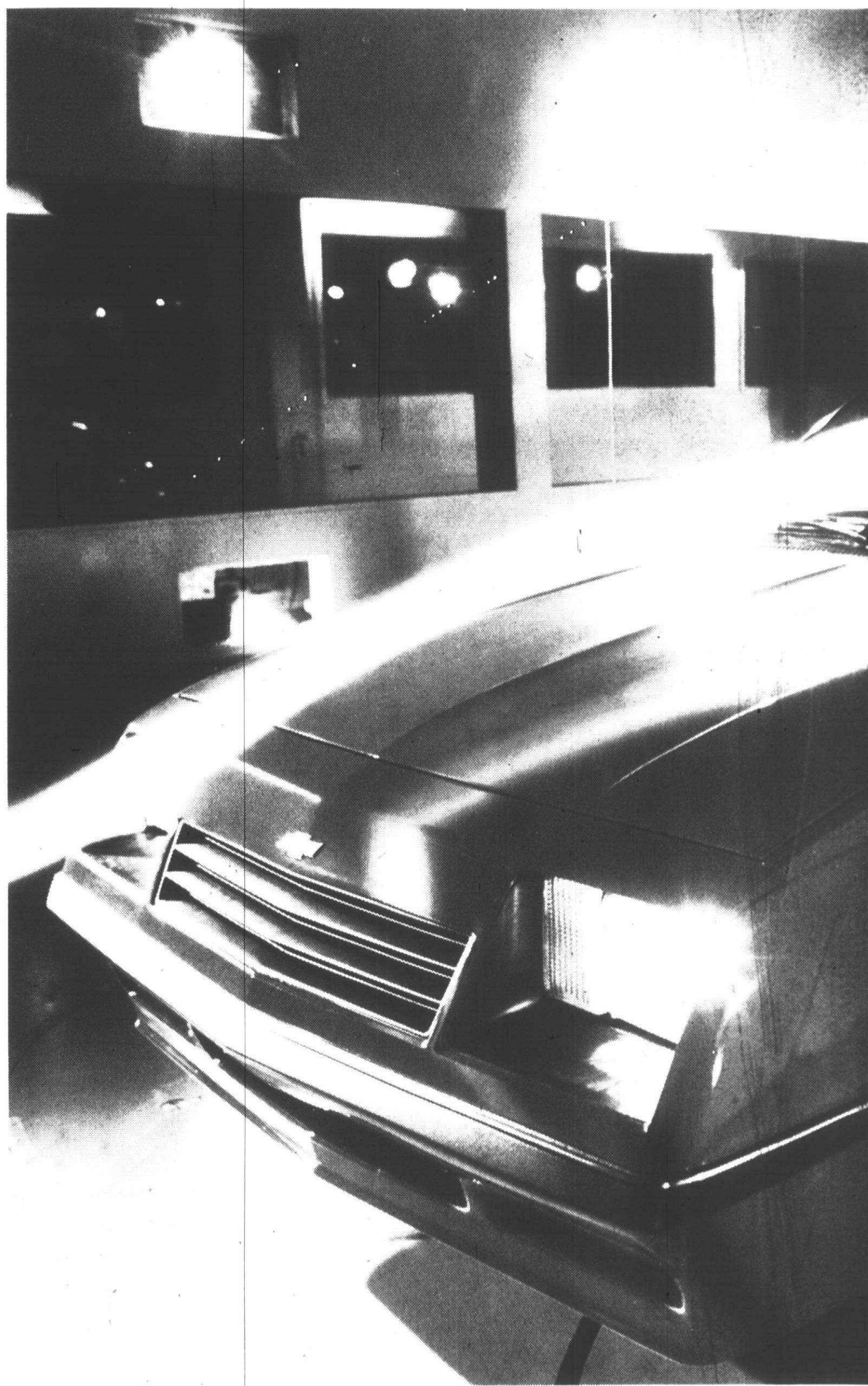

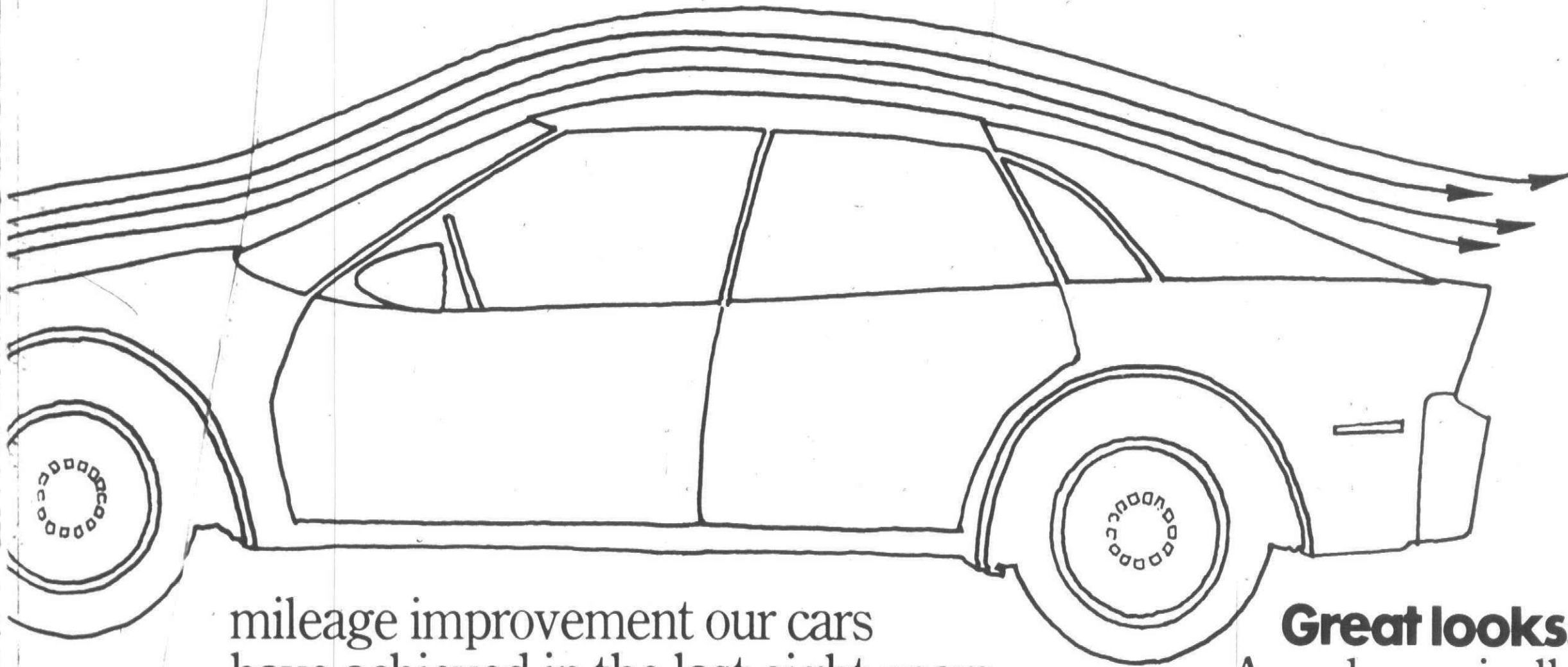

# Closed meeting bill passed by state Senate, 26-5

School boards, college boards and city councils would be able to evaluate top appointees behind closed doors under a bill which passed the Michigan Senate last week.

By a 26-5 vote, the Senate passed Senate Bill 790, amending the Open Meetings Act to allow more closed meetings.

Among those opposing the bill were

Donald Bishop, R-Rochester; R. Robert Geake, R-Northville; and Doug Ross, D-Southfield.

Supporters included William Faust, D-Westland; and Dana Wilson, D-Hazel Park.

The bill now goes to the House Committee on Towns and Counties, chaired by Rep. Thomas Brown, D-Westland, where it faces an uncertain fate. Brown's committee drafted the original act in 1975.

Gov. William Milliken vetoed a similar measure in 1980, charging closed

meetings would infringe on the public's right to see governing boards conduct public business. That bill had passed the Senate 34-0.

**THE BILL**, sponsored by Sen. David Plawecki, D-Dearborn Heights, would reverse two Court of Appeals decisions.

First, it would allow school superintendents, college presidents, city managers and the like to ask that their annual performance reviews be conducted behind closed doors, the same as with serious charges of misconduct in office.

Last year, the Court of Appeals ruled the Dearborn Board of Education must evaluate the school superintendent and president of Henry Ford Community College in public. The school board argued a performance evaluation was the same as a complaint or charge and sought to hold a closed meeting. But the court said, "Words should not

be stretched out of their ordinary meaning. A closed meeting is not permissible . . . in this case," and required an open meeting.

Second, the bill would allow parents of students who have been expelled or suspended by school boards to demand the students' names be deleted from the board minutes.

Earlier this year, the Court of Appeals ruled River Valley Board of Education, in Berrien County, could not delete the names of several students suspended for drug abuse from the minutes. It held that a board acts through its minutes and therefore could not withhold the record.

"IF YOU BELIEVE in the Open Meetings law, then there's no reason to further restrict it," Bishop said.

"Evaluations should be part of the public record. There are always at-

tempts to have exclusions in a bill because public bodies don't want the public to see the light," said Bishop, whose district includes Birmingham-Bloomfield, West Bloomfield and part of Troy.

Geake said he strongly opposed both of the bill's major provisions, saying that there shouldn't be closed public meetings for evaluations and disciplined student's names shouldn't be shielded.

"The public has the right to know how employees are evaluated," said Geake, whose district includes Livonia, Redford and Plymouth.

"There was active lobbying by the MEA (Michigan Education Association). They wanted to protect students, but not superintendents. I was not contacted by any one other than the education people," Geake said.

ROSS ECHOED their statements.

"If you're talking about evaluating a job of a public employee working for the taxpayer, then the meeting should be open to the taxpayer," he said.

Ross, whose district includes Farmington, added that he received no calls from any public official outlining problems with the bill.

Ross opposed the bill when it was reported out of the Senate State and Veterans Affairs Committee on a 3-1 vote. He successfully softened the amendment on student discipline by having it apply only to minor students.

Faust, whose district includes Canton and Garden City, and Wilson, whose district includes part of Troy, could not be reached for comment.

The bill was supported by the Michigan Association of School Administrators and the Michigan Association of School Boards. It was opposed by the Michigan Citizens Lobby and the Michigan Press Association.

## County questions Hines' patrolling

Wayne County Sheriff William Lucas is expected to answer charges today that his department is not living up to its obligations.

County Commissioner William Joyner, D-Plymouth, has asked Lucas to tell the commission why his department isn't performing duties specified in a funding contract with the state.

The contract, with the Michigan Office of Criminal Justice, provides \$885,000 for the sheriff's Road Patrol from Jan. 1 through Sept. 30.

According to the agreement, the Road Patrol officers' primary responsibilities are for traffic enforcement, related investigations and continued services including:

- Patrolling for drunk driving in areas affected by drinking drivers.
- Providing increased levels of patrol in county and state parks.
- Providing safety education programs.
- Working with local courts on driver improvement programs.

Lucas says his department is providing the described services as best it can.

Joyner argues the sheriff's department is not patrolling the county parks

and has asked Lucas for an explanation. He also placed the issue on today's commission agenda.

"The lack of solutions to problems in Hines Park are directly attributed to Bill Lucas not doing his job," says Joyner.

The sheriff's deputies aren't allowed to patrol Hines Park because there are no funds from the county board, according to Sgt. Ron Brown, road patrol supervisor.

Because of the lack of personnel and needed communication equipment, the deputies can't patrol the park, according to Lucas.

"On occasion they do go through the park, but their major function is secondary road patrol," he says.

"It is unsafe to patrol Hines Park with the limited number of officers we have."

"Putting one car in the park (which is all Lucas claims can be sent with the current number of deputies working) is sending them to certain danger," he says.

"It is not professionally possible to send the officers into the park."

Lucas says the only way he can send officers into Hines is if increased funding is provided. Some \$389,000 for park enforcement is expected if a park sticker plan is approved.

# Fitz's choice: Pick party or fight

Robert FitzPatrick is a man with a decision to make — to fight in court or switch parties.

The Wayne County Election Commission Monday gave FitzPatrick until 4 p.m. tomorrow to decide whether he wants to run for county executive as a Democrat or Republican. Otherwise, the election commission threatens to throw him off the ballot.

"If ever there was a case for a nonpartisan system, this is it," said FitzPatrick, 48, executive director of the county Economic Development Corp. who submitted petitions to run in both primaries. "I defy anyone to tell me one decision a county executive would make that is partisan."

It was his way of saying he hasn't made up his mind whether to run as a Democrat or a Republican or to fight a civil rights case in court. He

thinks he has a case.

"THERE'S A 30-year-old case in Dearborn Township which says you may run in only one party's primary or the other," said FitzPatrick.

"But since then we've had a new state constitution and statutes. The statute is silent. It doesn't say you can't run in both primaries."

FitzPatrick said laws prohibiting candidates from running in more than one party's primary have been ruled unconstitutional in the states of California and New York.

The Election Commission consists of County Clerk James Killeen, Treasurer Raymond Wojtowicz and Chief Probate Judge Joseph Pernick. Applying a statute which says a candidate may not be listed in more than one column, it ruled FitzPatrick would have to choose one party or be thrown off the ballot.

A LIFELONG Democrat, FitzPatrick decided suddenly to run in both primaries for the newly created post when a poll showed Sheriff William Lucas leading the pack with 54 percent.

To advocates of county reform, Lucas is the enemy. The sheriff has spent years in court resisting County Board of Commissioners' budgetary constrictions, once even refusing to observe a court order when he lost.

A Lucas victory in a Democratic primary could give minority Republicans a real shot at winning the chief executive post — hence FitzPatrick's desire to hedge his political bet by seeking the Republican nomination.

"I'd hate to see anyone steal this election," said FitzPatrick. "I mean 'steal' in the sense he (Lucas) runs on his name and face and won't dis-

cuss issues."

VOTERS IN Wayne County on Aug. 10 will nominate candidates to run Michigan's first home-rule charter county government — 15 members of the board of commissioners and a chief executive officer.

The chief executive will have budget-drafting powers and powers of appointment over all departments which don't report to an elected official such as the sheriff and prosecutor.

While FitzPatrick supported the charter, he criticized the Michigan Legislature for refusing to give county voters the option of choosing a nonpartisan form of government. The county charter may provide only for partisan elections. Since 1908, however, cities have been able to adopt charters providing for nonpartisan elections.

## Food distribution gets Westland home

Focus: Hope soon will have a new distribution center on the Wayne County General Hospital grounds in Westland, thanks to emergency action by the county board of commissioners last week.

The three-story former commissary is located conveniently near a rail spur. It is being cleared of hospital supplies and equipment. The first floor will be available Sept. 1, according to Commissioner Norbert Wisniewski, a member of the Board of Institutions and the Human Resources Committee.

Members of the committee, chaired by Arthur Blackwell, watched a video presentation earlier in the week provided by the Rev. William Cunningham, whose leadership in the Focus: Hope food programs has drawn thousands of volunteers across the nation.

CUNNINGHAM SAID Focus: Hope is a vital program that will bring many benefits to the low-income, elderly and handicapped residents.

Focus: Hope, like Wayne-Metro CSA, is a nonprofit organization which provides, as only part of its service, food to the needy households.

"The history of this agency has been

well documented," Cunningham said. "Currently it is serving more than 45,000 Wayne County residents with food stuffs prescribed by a medical physician."

"This operation has a pressing need to expand into western parts of the county because the long distance between present facilities and the additional needy in out-county is a terrible restriction."

THE COMMODITIES program is sponsored by the Department of Agriculture and will include passing out some 184,800 pounds of cheese.

In helping to describe the program, Luther J. Flanagan, executive director of the Wayne-Metropolitan Community Services Agency, said his biggest problem now is to determine how much space all that cheese will require.

Wayne-Metro also is providing food commodities to low-income families, but the difference is that Wayne-Metro's distribution is not based upon medical doctor's prescriptions. The state of Michigan has designated the Community Action Agencies as the distributors of the surplus food commodities stored by USDA in warehouses around the nation.

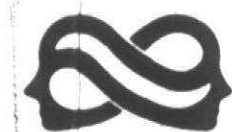

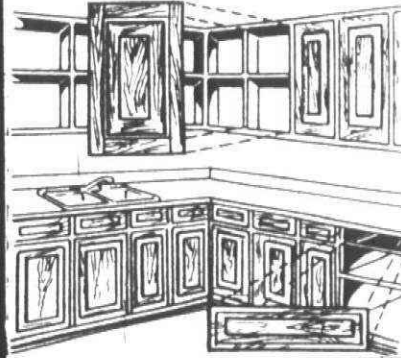

# No layoffs; county asks tax hike

Wayne County voters will decide the county's financial fate Aug. 10 when they go to the polls to approve or reject a one-mill tax increase.

If the tax measure fails, then Wayne County will be unable to meet its payroll in mid-August.

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners last week voted to toss the economic burden in the taxpayer's court when it canceled its plans to lay off 670 county employees today.

The vote to cancel the layoffs and go for the tax increase passed 14-7.

"THE CUTBACKS in personnel would be devastating to some departments," said Commissioner Mary E. Dumas, R-Livonia. "But at least it would mean we're making a serious attempt to remedy the deficit. (If the millage fails) I'm afraid we'll have to close the county down."

Dumas was among those who opposed placing the millage question on the ballot. Also opposed was Richard Manning, D-Redford.

Commissioners R. William Joyner, D-Plymouth, Kay Beard, D-Inkster, and Tom Presnell, D-Westland, favored asking for the millage.

"I favor the treasurer's idea who says we need an independent audit to determine just how large the deficit is," Joyner said, adding, "I do not believe, I do not trust, and I will not listen to the Wayne County auditors."

FACING A projected \$16.7-million deficit, the board last month approved

the 670 layoffs, hoping the action would encourage \$11 million in wage concessions from county employees.

However, Dumas said only supervisory employees and engineers said they would defer their cost of living allowance (COLA) for this year's two remaining periods and the first period of next year.

"We're still negotiating. But the (the commission majority) took away any additional power to negotiate (by rescinding the layoffs) that we had," Dumas added.

Joyner said he voted for rescinding the layoffs because the courts intervened to block a prospective layoff.

PROSECUTOR William Cahalan received a court injunction barring his department from layoffs. Sheriff William Lucas also reported he would go to court seeking a departmental layoff exemption.

"After listening to the sentiment of my colleagues, I saw we would have wound up laying off only a handful of people, and that wouldn't have accomplished anything," Joyner said.

Dumas said she is concerned the millage will fail and that county offices will be forced to shut their doors.

"I just don't think it's a realistic expectation to think the millage will pass. People are up in arms over taxes," she said.

The financial crisis results from an April report by the county Board of Auditors which projected a \$16.7-million budget deficit. The deficit was the result of present year revenue shortfalls of \$5.6 million and over-expenditures of \$11.1 million.



### Garbage pickup views are given

# Omnicom should loosen its purse strings

**T**HE FIRST ROUND of negotiations between Canton Township and Omnicom cablevision took place in Canton Township Hall Monday. Potential cable customers everywhere should be looking on.

At stake is a proposed compromise or clarification of Canton's contract with the statewide cable company. Canton believes Omnicom is not living up to its agreement, which includes a thick blue book of promises for more local programming staff and facilities and many more services which residents presently do not receive.

Omnicom, on the other hand, stresses the blue book contains proposals that are part of the "ultimate" cable package for residents.

These negotiations are important to all cable viewers because if Canton receives additional benefits from Omnicom, then Plymouth and Plymouth Township also will gain similar benefits based on an oral agreement with the cable company.

IT IS CLEAR that a compromise or clarification of the contract can be reached. There is plenty of room for negotiations.

The only question now is whether Omnicom is ready to change its penny-pinching attitude when negotiating services with Canton.

We believe it would be foolish in the long run for the cable company, owned by Capital Cities, not to cooperate with Canton, and ultimately the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

If other communities see Omnicom giving Plymouth-Canton a difficult time over services it already was promised, then it could be a fatal black-eye for a corporation which sees potential cable franchise growth in the state.

We believe Canton is willing to compromise on its position of gaining all the promises cited in the blue-book proposal. Clearly, some of the promises are "ultimate" services, as Omnicom states.

But Omnicom has failed to give the basic services promised — and expected — by this community.

The quality and quantity of local programming, for example, continues to deteriorate because Omnicom fails to properly staff a shared studio with the proper equipment or enough workers to produce local shows. Consequently, the number of local

shows — and the demand for these shows — dwindle each week.

OMNICOM'S ATTITUDE is difficult to explain. Omnicom stresses increased services, no matter how basic, will lead to higher subscription rates to residents.

Yet, at this time, Omnicom officials say the company has 9,178 subscriptions in the Plymouth-Canton community — 6,111 in Canton, 2,018 in Plymouth Township and 1,049 in the city of Plymouth.

It doesn't take a financial genius to calculate Omnicom's present revenues. Based on a conservative rate estimate of \$14 per month per household,

Omnicom grosses \$128,492 monthly and more than \$1.5 million annually in Plymouth-Canton alone. And this figure doesn't include installation fees, potential growth in the area and other revenue from franchises in Northville, Belleville and Hamtramck.

We believe this is a substantial dollar volume which should provide Omnicom its deserved profit, while giving residents the services they also deserve. Unfortunately, before Canton Township forced these negotiations, it has been a one-way deal, and Plymouth-Canton residents are getting the raw end of it.

Omnicom officials continually say they want to live up to their agreement with the Plymouth-Canton community. But Omnicom's business decisions and penny-pinching philosophies show otherwise.

It's time for Omnicom officials to change their attitude and re-examine the spirit behind their desire to live up to their promises to this community.

We believe Omnicom is maximizing on its short-term profits at the expense of many, many angry government officials and subscribers.

That's not good in the long run, is it?

## 'Paraplegic season' has begun

**T**WO University of Michigan physicians warn youths and their parents that a split second of unwise summer skylarking can result in a lifetime of permanent paralysis.

Drs. James R. Mackenzie, chief of emergency services at the University of Michigan Hospitals, and Frederick M. Maynard, director of the acute spinal cord injury program at the hospital, said that early June marks the beginning of what can be called the "paraplegic season."

"Within the past two weeks, seven young patients from throughout Michigan have entered our hospital in Ann Arbor for treatment of major paralysis resulting from spinal cord injuries," Mackenzie said.

"In early June, as soon as high school graduation festivities begin, spinal cord injuries begin to soar. The rate of injury in late June is more than double what it was in May."

DR. MAYNARD said most victims of spinal cord injury are aged 16-20. Many are under the influence of alcohol or drugs at the time of the injury.

A majority of the incidents result from auto accidents in which seat belts were not worn and from mishaps during water sports, he added.

"Advances in medical treatment have increased the number of survivors of spinal cord injuries," Maynard said. "But this, in turn, has forced them and society to incur considerable expenses."

"It's costly not just to insurance companies, but also to the victims and their families who must redesign their homes, add accessories to their cars and purchase very expensive mechanical and electrical wheelchairs."

THEY OFFERED these safety rules to prevent spinal cord injuries:

- Always wear a seat belt in an automobile.
- If you drink or are "high," don't drive or dive.
- Never dive in an unknown body of water or in one subject to changes in depth before checking out the depth all around the diving area.
- Don't dive deep in unknown waters. Make your first dive a belly flop.

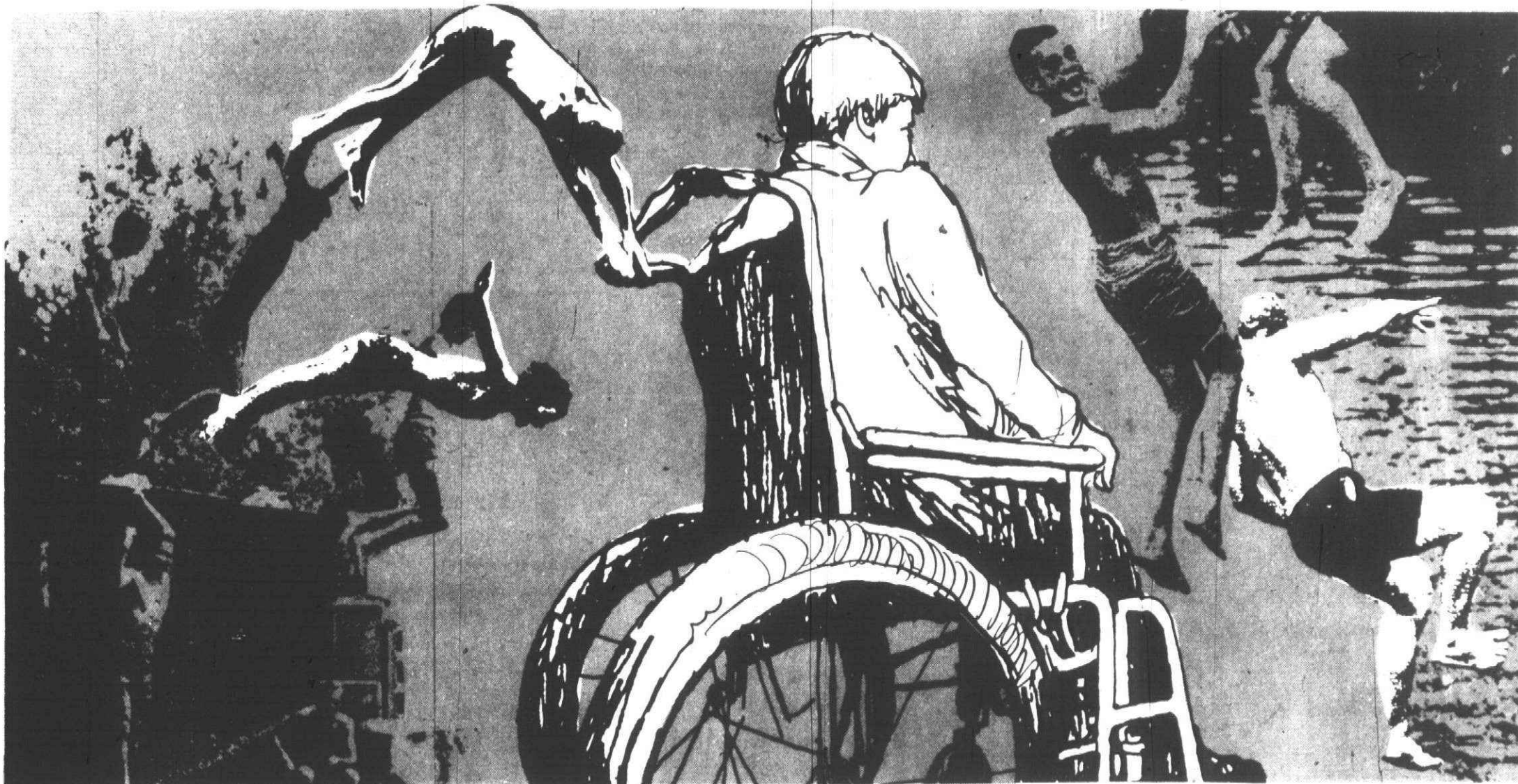
Present at a U-M news conference with Mackenzie and Maynard was Dennis Lovely, a former Ann Arbor carpenter who suffered a quadriplegic injury in July 1981.

Lovely said that after drinking a few beers he dived off a platform into a lake. He missed the deep-water dropoff and landed head-first in shallow water, breaking his neck. Now he has no movement or feeling below his chest and wrists and is confined to an electric wheelchair.

Although he feels the best prevention is such common sense advice as, "Be familiar with the area you will be swimming in, and wade in before you dive," Lovely thinks more publicity about the subject can help reduce spinal cord injuries.

"I think '30-second shock' announcements ought to be put on television where high school kids will see them," he suggested.

"And it would be a good idea, too, to describe some of these summer accidents at the high school graduation ceremonies."



## Trooper staffing: an immodest proposal

**M**ICHIGAN VOTERS are being hit by an avalanche of petition drives. Most are aimed at putting entirely unworthy constitutional amendments on the state ballot.

One group is aimed at either decreasing one's own taxes or increasing the other fellow's, or both. Another group is aimed at matters which are largely legislative in nature and have no business being in a state constitution.

Lt. Gov. James Brickley is pushing one of the few truly worthy ones — an attempt to shorten the ballot by allowing the governor to appoint the highest-ranking judges in the state. Even if you disagree with it, the Brickley proposal is worthy because it aims at a structural change in government. It is the kind of question that should be addressed by a constitution.

NEAR THE BOTTOM of the list is one being sponsored by the Michigan State Police Troopers Association. The troopers union wants guaranteed minimal staffing, and it wants that guarantee in the constitution.

My own first reaction was to be appalled at the utter arrogance of the notion. Just what makes one group so important that it alone is guaranteed minimum staffing?

Why not minimum staffing for the attorney gen-

eral's staff? It is being swamped by \$11 billion in lawsuits against the state, to the point where it can hardly prosecute.

Why not guaranteed minimum staffing for the folks who search out toxic waste dumps? We all may be poisoned if they don't do their jobs fully.

Why not guaranteed minimum staffing for the people who check out water pollution, air pollution, the safety of bridges, or the health of dairy herds? How about minimum staffing for the auditor general, so that local treasuries aren't robbed blind?

Those 73 Wayne County Road Commission managers are taking a lot of flak for trying to lock in their jobs for six years with a sweetheart union contract. The troopers union has topped them for gall by trying to lock their jobs into the constitution.

That was my first reaction.

THEN CAME the statement from Col. Gerald L. Hough, director of the State Police. Hough uncovered some arguments I hadn't thought of which made the union's proposal look even worse.

The troopers union proposal would create a constitutional conflict, Hough said. It would remove the State Police Department as one of the "principal departments" of state government, thus taking away the governor's supervision of it. But the constitution would still require the director of State Police to serve at the pleasure of the governor. That would be one confusing mess.

The proposal would provide for the setting of ranks by the constitution, Hough went on. Over the years, the department has had several ranks changed or eliminated. The state would lose all flexibility in making changes unless it went through the cumbersome procedure of asking the voters. Asking the voters about the level of taxes is one thing, but asking them about State Police rank changes is absurd.

Finally, Hough questions the advisability of setting the department's role by constitution. State Police responsibilities and duties have changed a great deal over time. State police roles in the 21st century should be determined by society's needs at the time, not a self-serving union proposal written in 1982.

## Joe left boxing 40 years too soon

**O**NE AFTERNOON in what the present generation would call the long ago, The Stroller was sitting in the office of Mike Jacobs, then the nation's top fight promoter.

The cubicle was in the Plymouth Theater building on 49th Street in New York City, and the crowds were gathering outside to attend the showing of "Tobacco Road," then the top play on the Big Apple's theatrical front.

But the real drama was taking place in the little office hidden away from the crowd.

Playing the leading role was Joe Louis, who was announcing his retirement from the ring, after successfully defending his heavyweight boxing title 14 times.

It was a dramatic moment, for Louis had run out of suitable opponents. When there was no one left to challenge him, he had no choice but to retire.

"JOE," SAID promoter Mike Jacobs, "we both have come along about 40 years too soon. The time is coming when you could fight in a telephone booth and get paid a million dollars."

Joe and his manager, John Roxborough, just smiled at the thought of that much money for a

single fight. After all, Joe had earned a trifle less than \$5 million for his 14 defenses. Talk of millions for a single fight seemed like a dream.

There was a bit of silence after Joe made his farewell remarks (though he was later called out of retirement and suffered a knockout defeat against Rocky Marciano).

Then Jacobs, with his gnashing dentures, rubbed his chin a bit and shocked everyone present by saying he, too, would retire.

"Joe and I came up together in this heavyweight business," he said, "and I guess it is only proper that we leave together. So this morning I am retiring, too."

THIS SCENE comes back to The Stroller almost every morning when he picks up his paper and

reads that fighters are getting as much as \$10 million for a single bout.

That is the purse that both Larry Holmes, the present heavyweight champion, and Gerry Cooney, his challenger, each received for a fight held in the parking lot of a hotel in Las Vegas.

It wasn't quite as small as the telephone booth that Jacobs had mentioned at Louis' retirement session, but it was the next smallest thing.

Just imagine: Each fighter receiving twice as much for one fight as Louis earned in his entire career.

One can get some idea as to the demands that will be made in the future when he reads that Tommy Hearn, the Detroit welterweight who suffered a knockout in his fight with Sugar Ray Leonard, called off his proposed fight with "Marvelous Marv" Hagler because he was to get only \$2 million for a bout in the Windsor Arena. Hearn wanted \$3.5 million and staged in the Silverdome.

Imagine that, for a fellow just coming off a knockout defeat. In the old days, a fighter would fight for almost nothing to get a chance to meet a champion.

So Mike Jacobs spoke a whole truth that dramatic moment in the long ago when he told Joe Louis that both of them had come along 40 years too soon.

## Be ready for the big play at boys, girls baseball games

Even though we're in the midst of Little League baseball season, it's not too late to capture some good pictures of the action on film. Imagine how rewarding it would be through the use of photographs to look back on some of those cherished moments that happen only once in a lifetime to our kids.

With the right equipment, right film, and a little knowhow, it's easy to record some of those precious moments that keep memories alive.

Here are some tips to help you get better pictures of your son or daughter as they join in the action and excitement of the cry of "play ball."

**THE BEST WAY** to get impact in your shot is to fill the frame with the action. Moving in as close as you can and using a telephoto lens in the range of 135mm - 200mm will best do the trick.

A zoom lens is ideal because it gives you a wide range of focal lengths from which to select.

Most often, you'll want to use a wide

aperture to minimize depth-of-field, thus blurring any distracting objects in the background. The large aperture will also give you a desirable fast shutter speed.

Use 400 ASA film for either color and black and white. Fast film will enable you to shoot at faster shutter speeds in order to "freeze" the action.

In black and white, Kodak Tri-X is a good choice. In color, use Kodachrome 400 (for prints) or Ektachrome 400 (for slides). If lighting conditions are not favorable, you can "push" these films to get extra speed out of them.

Some points to keep in mind when using fast shutter speeds: If the action is moving in a perpendicular direction to you, use a speed of at least 1/500 to stop the action. If the action is coming towards you or at a slight angle, 1/125 or 1/250 will do.

**LEARN AND** study the game to help you anticipate where the action is going to be.

If you expect a play at home plate,

be in focus with exposure set and ready to shoot when the play occurs. Try to catch the action at its peak by developing a hair-trigger state of readiness.

Practice will enable you to predict when the peak of the action will happen. Before you know it, you'll be able to capture on film the exact moment the bat connects with the ball or the slide comes into home.

"Panning" with the action will give you some unusual pictorial effects. By using a shutter speed of 1/60 second and moving the camera with the action such as a base runner, the result will be a sharp subject and a blurred background.

**DON'T OVERLOOK** expressions in faces. Candid pictures of young faces showing happiness, excitement, even sadness and disappointment will reward you with treasured moments on film. Beside, the kids' natural expressions all help to tell the story of Little League ball.

While we're talking about baseball, the advice mentioned will help you in photographing other spring/summer sports such as soccer or tennis. The important thing is to be tuned into the game and tuned into your camera so that you'll enjoy your own "instant replays" on film for a long time to come.

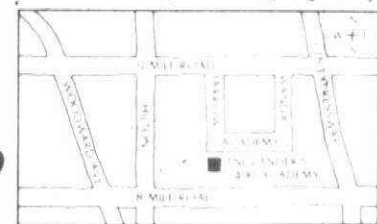

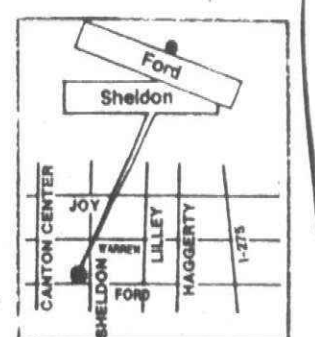

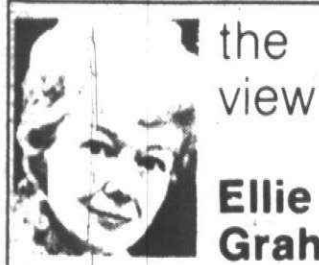

He has mapped his course over the old routes with their wide shoulders and side roads. He loves the byways and the small towns.

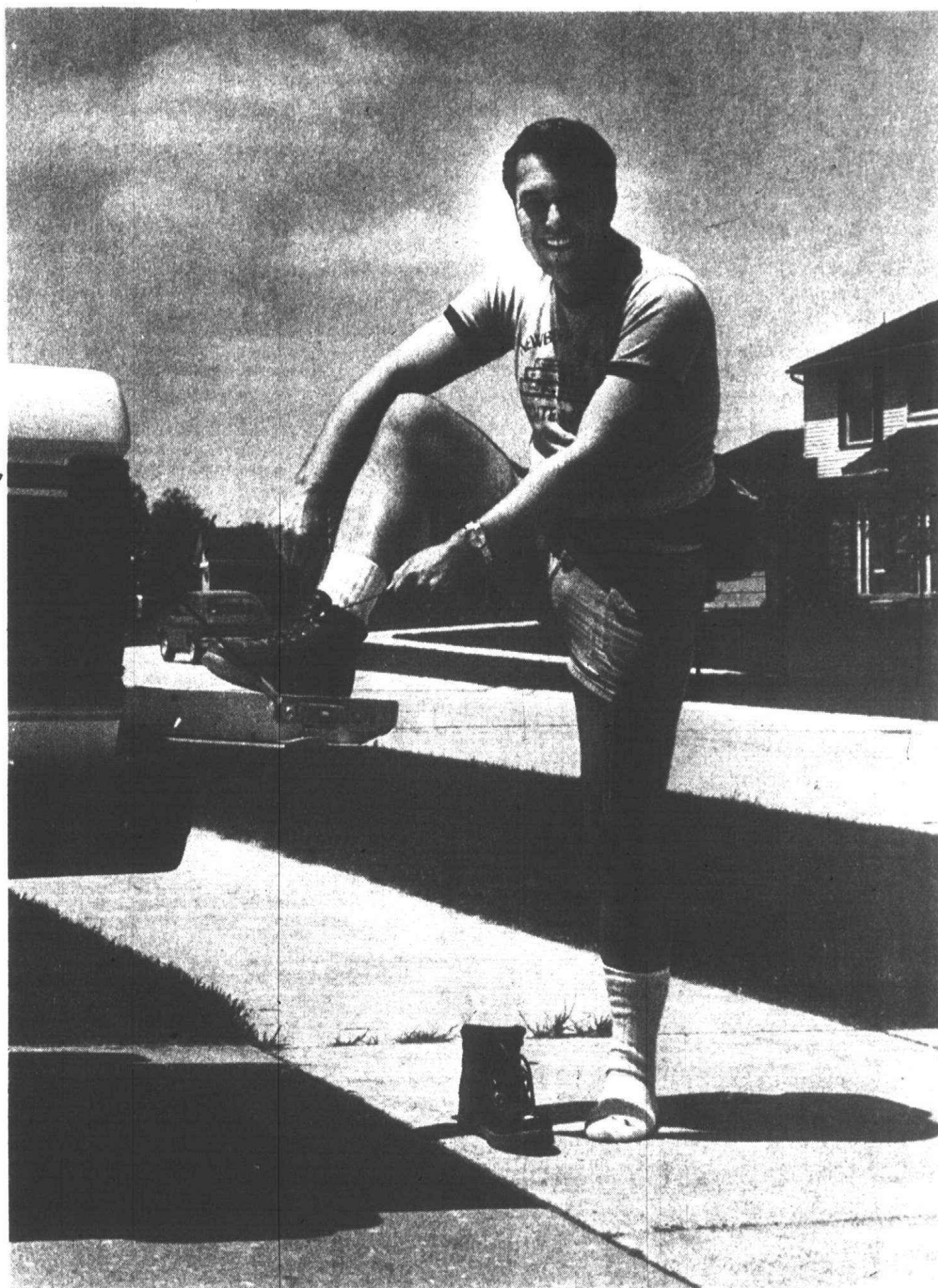
"Early one morning, when I was starting out, I saw deer tracks right on the Main street of Atlanta," said Aho.

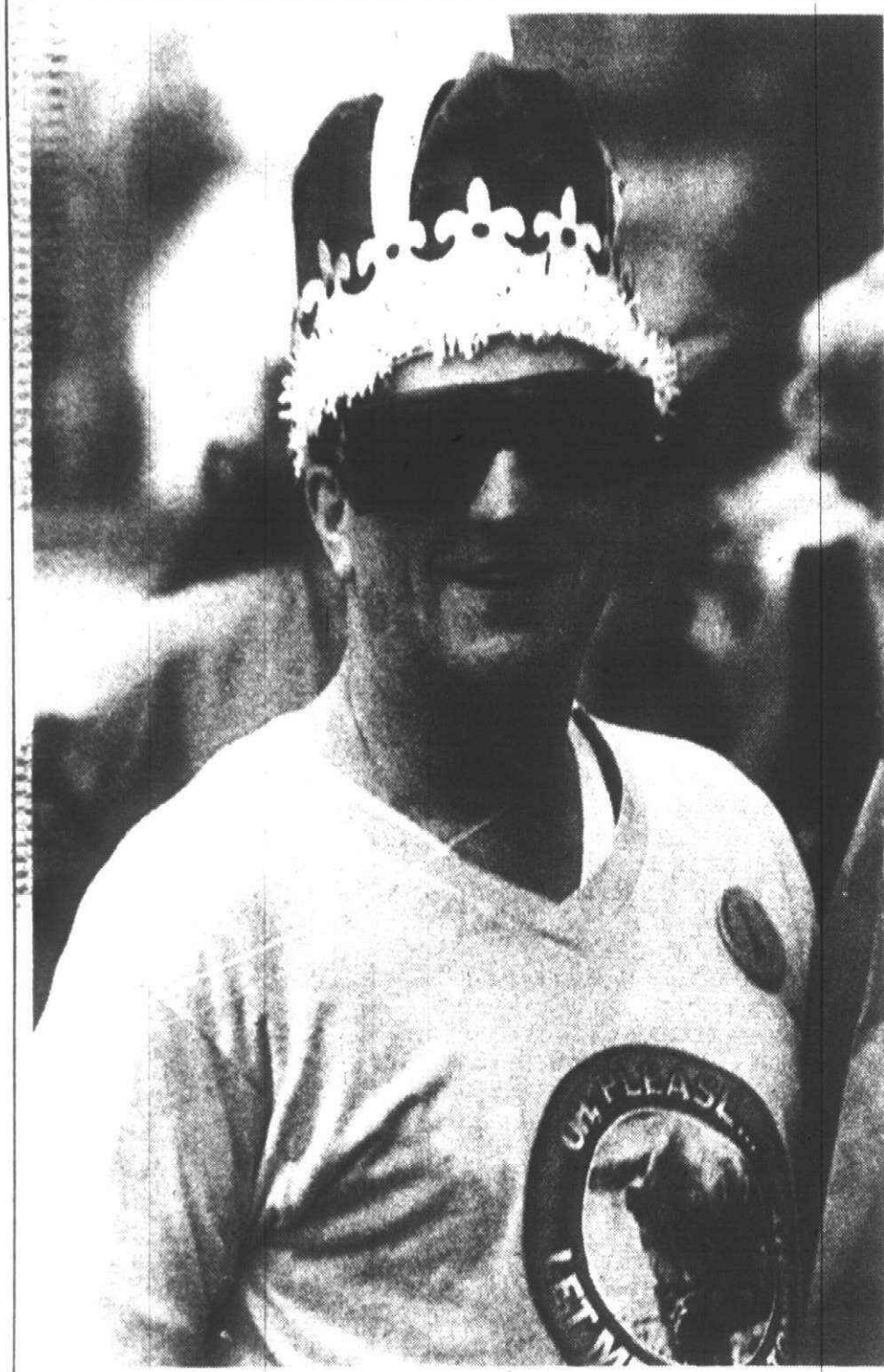

## Father's Day rose show has international theme

Three styles of rose arranging and three challenges to special groups of rose arrangers will be featured at the 1982 annual rose show Sunday at Matthaei Botanical Gardens, Ann Arbor. Carrying out the theme "Roses 'Round the World," exhibits may be entered by any rose grower following the guidelines set by the Huron Valley Rose Society.

The rose show, chaired by Gary

Hausman of Plymouth, will be open to the public, free of charge, from 2-7 p.m. Sunday.

Arrangements, featuring arranger-grown roses, are to be placed in the show personally by exhibitors 7-10 a.m. Sunday. All work on each entry must be completed elsewhere.

Modern and abstract designs are not limited in size. They must reflect the title "Pearl of the China Sea." Oriental-

style arrangements, using a figurine, are to follow the theme, "Teahouse of the August Moon," again with no size limit.

TRADITIONAL rose arrangements have been divided into three types: "I'm a Yankee Doodle Dandy," 18-inch maximum, a mass arrangement; "When Irish Eyes are Smiling," 24-inch maximum, a line-mass design; and "Scarborough Fair," 30-inch maximum, a line arrangement using Hogarth's curve or a crescent.

Special challenges of any style arrangement have been described as follows: Men, "Fox and Hounds," maximum 24 inches; Juniors (17 and under), not over 15 inches, "Scottish Morn on the Moors;" and Novice (anyone who has never entered an arrangement in an HVRS show), no size limit, "International Village."

In addition, miniature roses may be used in arrangements of three different sizes: not exceeding eight inches, "Barvarian Holiday;" no larger than six inches, "South of the Border;" and not more than three inches, "Swiss Miss."

DRIED LARGE roses may be used in

a design 24 inches or less, "God Save the Queen." Dried miniature roses may be entered in an arrangement not more than eight inches, "The Heather on the Hill."

Any style is acceptable.

Additional exhibitor information about arrangements and all other classes of the rose show is provided in a schedule which may be picked up at the reception desk of the Matthaei Gardens during lobby hours.

Like June flowers, Bible schools are bursting out all over.

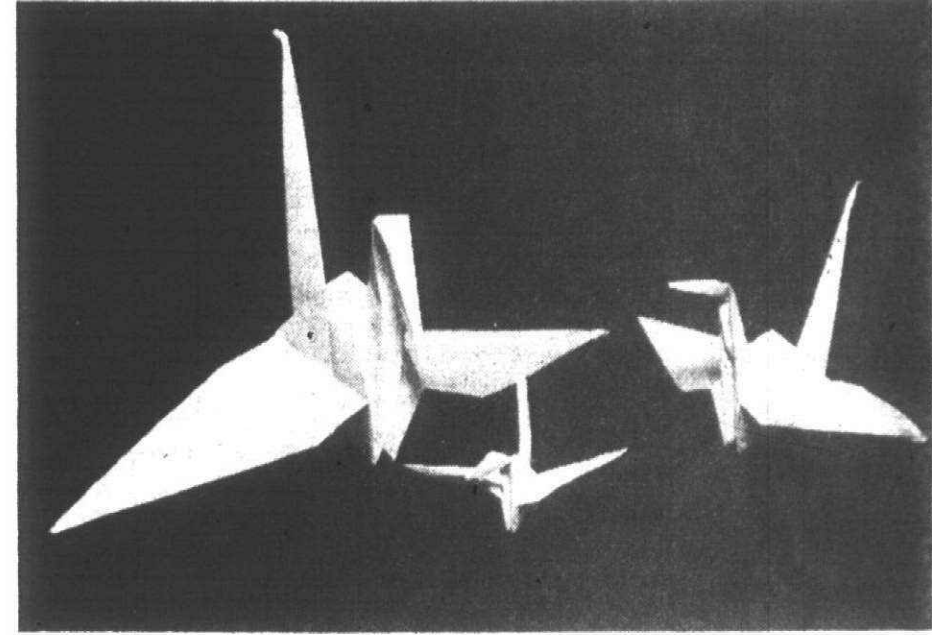
The schools will be offering as special features children's love feasts, handicrafts galore, singing, clowns, puppets, Bible stories, magic and sometimes surprises.

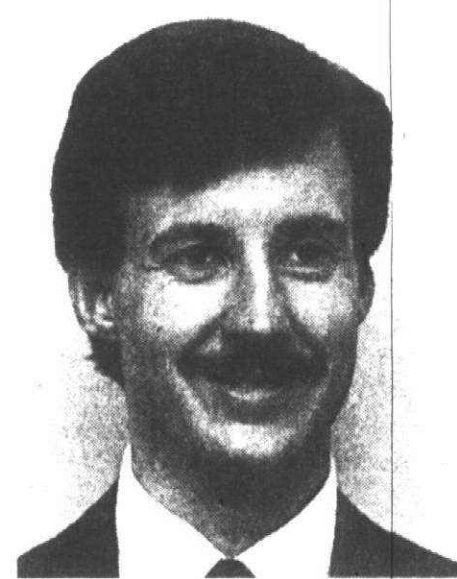

## Graham risking reputation for faith

Billy Graham, traveler to Russia, has ignored the taboos and mixed religion and politics. In doing so he is now charged with having been duped.

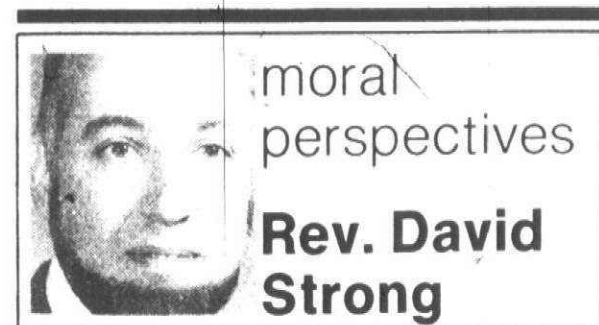
He has broken the sacred rule of American politics which is that no matter what the Russians do you must show that you are opposed to them. They must always be identified as our mortal enemy.

Billy Graham had some good things to say about the church in Russia and his treatment by Soviet authorities. The problem is that Billy Graham is Christian. As a man of Scripture he must deal with a faith which says "love your enemies."

When we examine this biblical passage we find that it is not simply a new rule about loving your enemies. It takes us into the very issue of identifying the nature of God himself.

HAVING SPENT some time in Eastern Europe and in the Soviet Union, I know that anyone who would seek to live out this truth of faith faces a problem. It is that what anyone may do or say may be used for propaganda purpose.

This is a risk faced by anyone who would be a reconciler, what is done or said may be used for

propaganda by the Russians. Likewise such an attempt at understanding or at reconciliation is likely to be used to discredit the American in his own country. This is the most painful side of the task of being a peacemaker.

Billy Graham faces another difficult problem as a Christian. His scripture makes it clear that his fellow Christians in the Soviet Union are his brothers and sisters, "one body" together.

Together they share in the sacrifice and redemption of Christ.

How does it feel to stand in the Baptist Church in Moscow and realize that your own government is poised to destroy your own flesh and blood in the faith?

Such a firsthand experience has a way of changing people. The world looks different when you realize that these Russian Christians are part of us. Theologically we and they are one. It says so in the Bible.

BILLY GRAHAM has not been duped. He has had the courage to face the reality of his faith and has risked the compromising of his reputation.

This is not different from the risk than many other reconcilers have faced. Others have given of their security and even of their life to seek reconciliation with "the enemy."

I believe that Billy Graham must have known some of the risk to his reputation which he would face if he went to a peace conference in the Soviet Union. It is not the same as going to lunch at the White House. Apparently he believes that the issues of faith and world peace is worth this risk.

Enough have faulted Billy Graham for his decision. Hopefully others will see this trip as an expression of a deepened and more comprehensive faith. He is a man who has given much to the world. Perhaps he has even more to give.

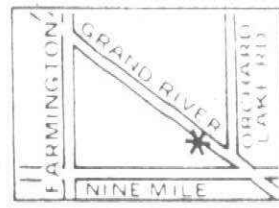

# Chiefs move baseball powwow to CMU

What a difference a day makes. Plymouth Canton's hopes of making the state Class A baseball finals looked gloomy on Tuesday as Warren Cousino jumped out to a 2-0 lead before a series of nasty thunderstorms hit the University of Michigan's Fisher Field.

The game resumed yesterday at Canton's home field in the third inning. By that time, however, the Chiefs completely turned things around, exploding for five runs in the third inning and going on for a 10-2 win over the Patriots.

Canton, a three-time semifinalist, will be making its first appearance in the finals. The Chiefs will play for the coveted crown against Midland at 5:30 p.m. Saturday at Central Michigan University.

"It was nice to come back," said Canton coach Fred Crissey. "It's a big thing for our kids."

The Chiefs came out swinging on their home turf, wasting little time.

Junior shortstop Don Dombey greeted Cousino pitcher Steve Gomola with his 10th homer of the year, a shot to right-center field in the bottom of the third to cut Cousino's lead to 2-1. Gomola then walked Scott Bricker, and coach Pete Martin had seen enough. He brought in reliever Mike Daar.

"THE RAIN hurt us in terms of pitching and momentum," said Martin. "Steve just didn't feel right. He was stiff."

"I thought we had started some momentum when it rained," said Crissey, whose team left three runners stranded in the second inning at U-M. "We were down two and had to get some offense. Then Dombey came out and — boom! — that was the trigger."

Daar had trouble getting anyone out as Canton sent nine batters to the plate. Fred Rumberger, who has been getting the clutch hits all season long, singled home Bricker and Bryan Capnerhurst to make it 3-2. Catcher Bill Hanis followed with another single, scoring two more runs.

Meanwhile, Cousino, which scored two runs and had five hits against Canton starter Jamie Chilcoff on Tuesday, found a different stranger on the mound Wednesday.

It was Canton's ace, Dan Smith, who responded by shutting out the Patriots the rest of the way. He allowed just two

hits and struck out three for his 29th career win. Cousino threatened in the third, but Smith averted danger when he picked off Keith Gucwa at third base for a big out.

"SMITH shut us down," said Martin. "He's a real good pitcher. He did a nice job."

Canton is now 25-4 overall. The Patriots, who knocked off Catholic League powers Gallagher and Detroit Catholic Central in the regional, bowed out at 23-9.

"It was hard to repeat last year's performance because they had a lot of pressure on their backs," said Crissey, whose 28-3 team reached the semifinals before falling to state champion Gallagher.

Canton added two runs in the fourth inning when Scott Bricker's perfect hit-and-run single scored Dombey, who advanced home on overthrow at third. Marty McCarthy then brought Bricker in with a sacrifice fly.

In the fifth, Canton increased its lead to 8-2 when Mike Scarpello singled and later scored on an infield error.

Bricker said he noticed a difference in the team's attitude on Wednesday.

"We had to think about a lot of things (after Tuesday)," said the spunky second baseman. "We were tight (at Michigan). The defense was OK, but we were not the Plymouth Canton club that goes out and hits."

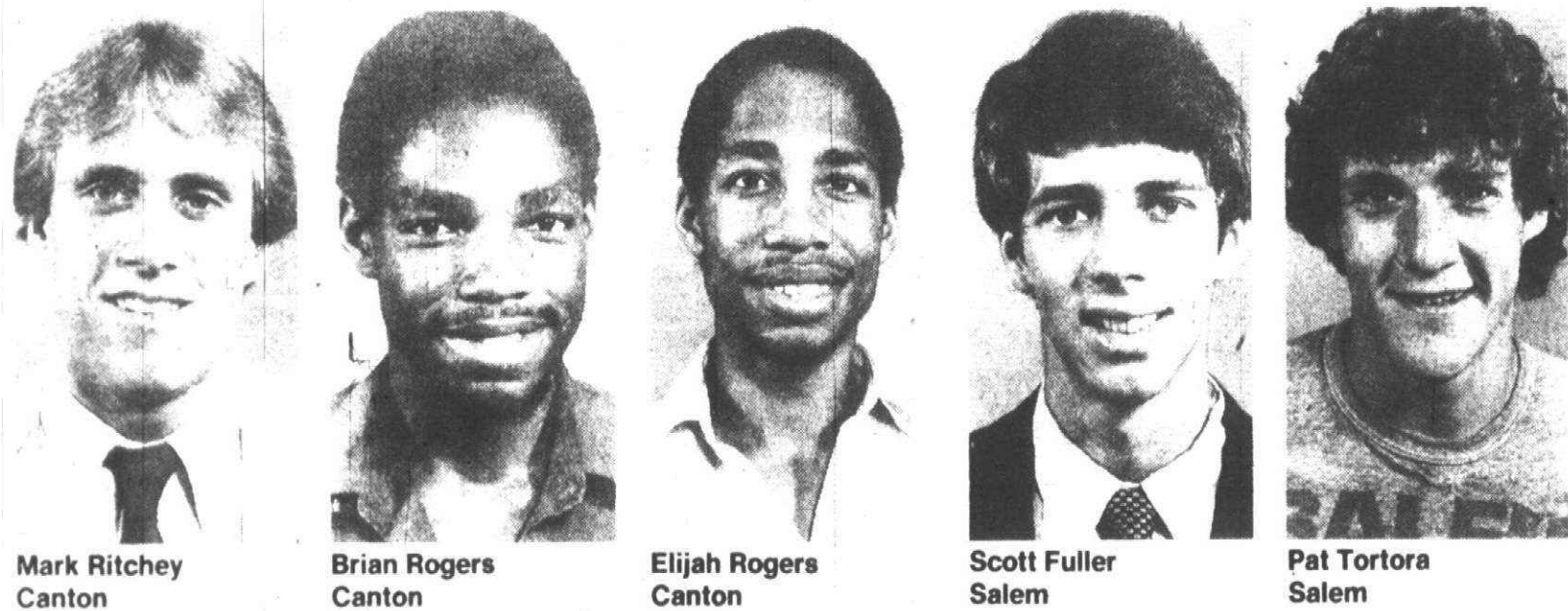
"We really felt relaxed on our home field. It was a great feeling."

## Impressive seasons for prep stars Numbers total track success

'The sports world is a numbers' racket. Without some combination of numerals — scores, places, times, etc. — sports would not exist.

In boys' track, one has to know which numbers signify excellence. High numbers are good in the field events but bad on the track. Low numbers are the goal in track competition but the bane of field athletes.

Sound confusing? It wasn't to Observerland boys' track competitors. Several put together all the right numbers, capping fine seasons with solid performances in league, regional and state meets to lead this year's All-Observer boys' track squad.

Indeed, three area athletes — Plymouth Salem's Scott Fuller, Detroit Catholic Central's Pat Reid and Redford Union's Tom Babits — placed among the top six in their

events at the Class A state meet in Flint June 5.

And the area's best trackman was not a member of that trio, in the consensus of the coaches who selected the All-Area team.

That honor went to Salem's Scott Bublin, selected for his performances in the 110-meter high hurdles (see story on this page). An injury at the regionals forced Bublin to miss the Class A state meet.

Here are the athletes selected during the area's coaches meeting for the All-Area boys' track team.

### FIELD EVENTS

**Scott Fuller, Salem, high jump** — Fuller peaked at the end of the season, saving his best performances for last. A senior who was All-Area a season ago, Fuller took third in the Observerland Relays with a leap of 6

feet and was second at the Stevenson relays, clearing 6-2.

Fuller won the Brighton regionals by leaping 6-3 and his jump of 6-6 was good for fourth in the state. He cleared 6-0 in 10 of 11 meets this year.

**Pat Reid, Catholic Central, shot put** — A senior, Reid qualified for the state meet in each of the past three seasons and placed fourth this year. His best throw was 58-10, and he won the regionals at Livonia Church-ill by throwing 58-4.

Reid's other accomplishments include his second straight Catholic League championship, a first in the Operation: Friendship tournament and the Whelan Award winner, presented to the best scholar/athlete/gentleman at CC. He will attend the University of Tennessee in the fall.

## Bublin named top trackster

Scan the Observer's listing of boys' track times, and several names will appear in two, three and even four events.

Those are the type of athletes coaches relish. Their versatility makes them an enormously valuable commodity to any track program.

When it came to the coaches' selection of Trackman of the Year, versatility was a key factor in choosing Scott Bublin of Plymouth Salem. But it was not the only reason Bublin was honored.

The Rock senior is not just decent in several events. He is exceptional.

**BUBLIN COMPETED** in four individual events during the season and ran on two relays. His ratings as compared to other area athletes: first, 110 meter high hurdles; second, 100 meter dash; second, 200 meter dash; third, 300 low hurdles; and first as a member of Salem's 400 and 800 meter relay teams.

He was selected to the All-Area team for his accomplishments in the 110 high hurdles, which included a best time of 14.4 and championships at the Observerland Relays and Suburban Eight League meet. He holds the Salem school record.

Summing up is simple: Bublin never lost a race in the 110 hurdles.

His accomplishments in the 100 dash are nearly as impressive. Bublin has won the 100 yard event at the Observerland Relays two straight years. His best time in yards this season is 10.0, for meters 10.9, both school records. Again, he won the Sub 8 title and lost only once in seven races in the 100 this season.

## Baseball's past is good business

I couldn't help feeling a little sad when I saw some of what they keep under glass at the Old Ball Park in Livonia.

Here they are asking for — and sometimes getting, according to the management — a few bucks more than the original price for some of the same kinds of things I used to hoard back in my sports pack-rat days.

I had Baseball Digest magazines from the late 1940s purchased in bulk from some grungy bookstore. One magazine I remember had a cover story about Pittsburgh's new manager: Hank Greenberg, "The Brain." Another carried an article called "Spring Training For Fans" by Bob Considine.

I had programs for the Syracuse Nationals pro basketball teams of the mid-1950s. Dolph Schayes and Earl Lloyd played on those teams. I had lots of baseball programs, including the one from that night in 1961 when Warren Spahn beat the Chicago Cubs for his 300th career pitching victory.

I had a lot of stuff. After surviving for years in a musty basement, my treasures were tossed. And thinking of it brings on the

gloom, not just because the stuff might be valuable now, but because of the pleasure I used to get from looking at it.

**BUT HIT** The Old Ball Park with those sentiments and you're likely to cause some major-league yawns by owner Mike Leahy and his staff.

"We hear this all the time," said Leahy, who ditched a lucrative sales career to open this sports-souvenir Valhalla in 1980.

"You're the first one who hasn't blamed his mother for throwing it out."

While it's true that Leahy keeps some valuable old stuff in a glass case in the middle of his 4,000-square-foot store in a strip shopping center at Merriman and Five Mile

roads, those oldies amount to only about 2 percent of his rather brisk sales.

"It gets a lot of reaction, but that (old) stuff doesn't sell," Leahy said.

What does sell are Tiger caps (more than 1,000 in two weeks), parts of "official" major-league uniforms (\$114 for a Phillies jersey with ROSE stitched on the back) and bubble gum baseball cards (Leahy claims half a million, most encased in clear plastic and held in loose-leaf notebooks).

Aside from all this fabric and cardboard, there are other interesting things: Lance Parrish's "game-worn" baseball shoes, spit shined to a high gloss (\$49.95); a bat autographed in ink by Al Kaline (\$175); a row of four green Tiger Stadium seats (\$95).

**SUPER BOWL XVI** gave the place a big boost. The store, satisfying souvenir hunters, did \$700,000 worth of business in three weeks, according to Leahy. His, uh, turnstiles are humming to the point that he's been able to open a new store in Southfield's Northland Center and is "looking around"

The only shadow cast on Bublin's season came in the league meet, when he fell and was injured in the low hurdles, forcing him to miss the state meet.

**Tom Babits, Redford Union, pole vault** — Babits' list of titles for the season is impressive — Spartan Relay champion, first at the Observerland Relays, best at the Bloomfield Hills Lahser Relays and tops in the Northwest Suburban League.

In state competition, Babits, a senior and team co-captain, continued his out-

standing season by winning the regional at Churchill and placing fifth in the state. Twice this season Babits vaulted over 14-8.

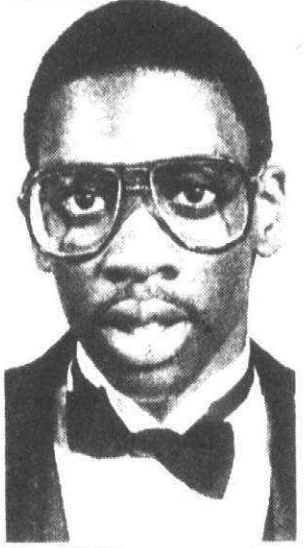

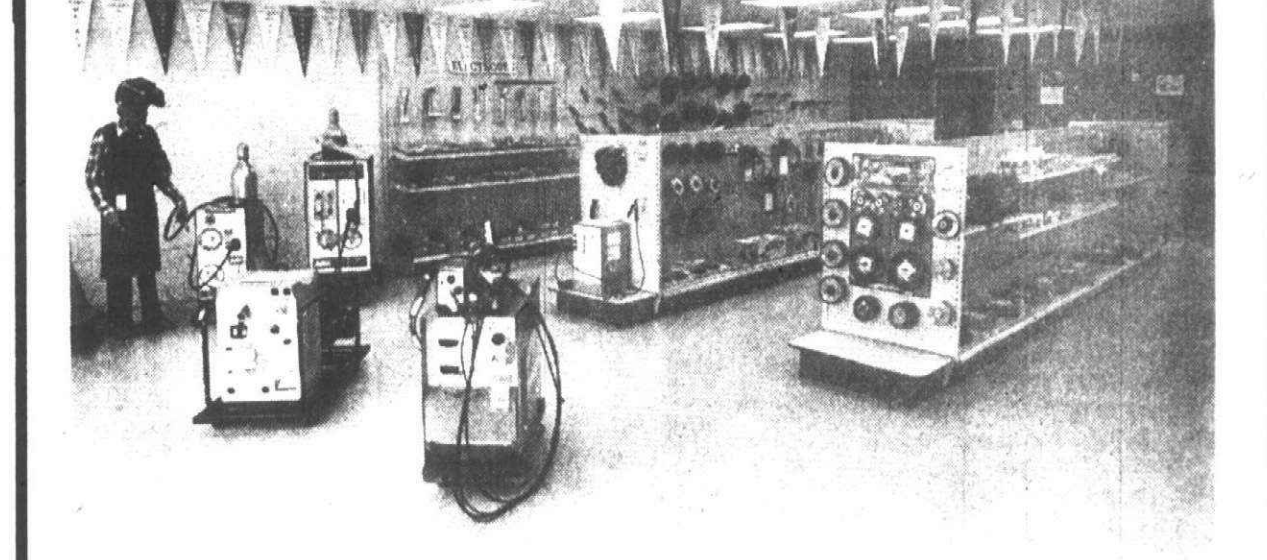

It's unfortunate that John Wayne made only one good film after "The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance" in 1962, and that turned out to be his last film, "The Shootist" (1976). But in among the "Brannigans," "McQs" and "The Green Berets," at least, are a couple of interesting films, "True Grit" (1969) and "The Cowboys" included.

Mark "On Golden Pond" Rydell directed "The Cowboys," which is interesting because it effectively casts Wayne as the aging, mythic, Western hero, while "Brannigan" and "McQ" simply thrust the past-retirement-age star into middle-age-man roles. Rydell's West was aging, too.

In "The Cowboys," Wayne is confronted not by his former, mythic counterpart, the gunslinger, but by a psychotic gun nut, played by Bruce Dern, who's more a product of the turbulent, terroristic 1960s than of the manifest destiny 1870s. It's a world in which Wayne really cannot function for long and, fittingly, this is one of the few films in which he bites the bullet at the end. Colleen Dewhurst and Slim Pickens also star. Rating: \$3.

# Tasters compare 1974 Cabernets

The 1974 vintage in Northern California was an extremely fine one for Cabernet Sauvignon, the best since 1970 and perhaps not equalled until 1980. As such, it is now an increasing sport to monitor the development of these wines.

To do exactly this, 49 people recently gathered under the auspices of the Winetasters to sample 10 of them. Because you may be holding some of these, and because many of them are currently still available on local wine shelves, I decided to report the findings of that tasting:

Curiously, the clear preference of the evening, Chateau Montelena, won in spite of potentially defective corkage. Two of the three were weakened and did not seem secure as sealers of the wine within. Perhaps the slight air seepage had helped the wine to more fully mature; it was a lovely, graceful, balanced thing, worthy of its name. It is now ready to drink.

The Fetzer was full of the Mendocino richness and complexity we have come to expect, still holding tannin in abundance.

The Semi Special Vintage was an incredible wine, tasting much younger than its age. Full of berry-like fruit and possessing great aromas, it was almost overwhelming in its intensity.

Also ready to drink now, the Chappellet was perhaps the most elegant wine of the group.

WITH ITS ALMOST legendary history and overwhelming price tag, the Mayacamas was a bit of a disappointment. It was a bit flat and simple, perhaps going through a dumb stage in its development as big Cabernets are prone to do. Not so the Trinity Vine, a negotiant wine made by Souverain. Very drinkable; relatively direct and full of good Cabernet flavor. This one has peaked now.

The Gemello was the brute of the evening, massive and intense and potent. This kind of wine can destroy the

palate for any wine tasted near it. But if you like them this way, as some do, this was quite a bottle.

The Martini was the other elegant wine of the evening but a bit too lacking in complexity and depth. It needs no further aging.

The Phelps was his first effort with this grape and was one of the few times one of his wines failed to impress. Not flawed, it seemed to be out of focus. The Concannon Ltd., usually light and direct wines, was neither. This had muddy, earthen tones about it, along with some browning in taste. One to be avoided.

# Scarecrow plays a different kind of sound

**D**EFINITELY OUTSTANDING in its field is Scarecrow, a Detroit-area group with a style not common to local bands.

Timothy Cohan, 24, of Bloomfield Hills; Rich Millett, 25, of West Bloomfield, and Steve Hines, 32, of Sterling Heights have released a 45-rpm disc recorded at Supersound Studios, Detroit, in a session last summer that began one midnight and lasted to 8 a.m.

The record features guitarist/key-boardist Cohan's "To Whom It Won't Concern" and lead vocalist/drummer Millett's "Any Time of Day."

Scarecrow has a clean, pop sound reminiscent of many '60s bands such as the Moody Blues, the Beatles, the Rascals and even early Beach Boys. "Any Time of Day" is an uptempo acoustic number with Paul-Simon-influenced guitar, prominent bass and very active drums.

MILLETT, WHO was born in England, describes "Any Time of Day" as "a pop/reggae tune with simple lyrics. It's about someone looking for a love."

"To Whom It Won't Concern" is rhythmic and contains a lead guitar part that jumps out at you. "Our single is fairly representative of what we do," Cohan said, "but we also do some harder rock and softer acoustic numbers."

"One thing I want the people to know about the record," Hines said, "is that there's too much hard rock around here. Our record doesn't sound local, it's reggae-ish rock or light rock. It doesn't really sound like the Beatles but it does use that kind of

technique. Also, the lyrics will make you think."

"I'm tired of lyrics that just have to do with sex," Millett said. Rock gets a bad name because not enough people care about the music."

Cohan and Millett, who write the majority of the group's material, attended Andover High School together and later shared a dorm at Central Michigan University. "We used to cut classes to write songs together," Cohan said with a laugh.

MEMBERS OF Scarecrow all have day jobs but would like to give them up soon for the music. "I just love music," Hines said. "It's a life's dream."

Scarecrow was born when Cohan and Millett grew tired of playing in other bands. In high school they had an eight-piece jazz band called Napoleon in the style of the popular group Chicago. Cohan and Millett had the concept for Scarecrow even before Hines was added to the group three years ago.

"Rich was playing in a bar band in which Steve was the bass player," Cohan said. "After that band broke up we all hit it off so well that we formed Scarecrow."

Scarecrow is presently looking for

a fourth member to play keyboards so Cohan can concentrate on guitar. "Once we start playing live we're also going to need another drummer," Cohan said, "because Rich will be doing mostly lead vocals."

"Steve is really the main reason we'll play live," Millett said, "because he really wants to."

"WE'LL PROBABLY play a lot of rock 'n' roll live," Hines said, "but we'll calm it down in the studio."

"I want our show to be more lights and subtleties than most bands," Millett added.

The problem Scarecrow has had with playing live is that its music is just too diverse. "Our variety has been one of our major problems," Cohan said. "People at bars want rock, punk or folk but not a variety."

"And a band should be versatile," Hines said.

"The first thing they ask you is who you sound like," Cohan said. "We always say, 'We can name some of our influences, but we don't think we sound like them. I think they want a band who can be easily pigeonholed.'"

Scarecrow's particular style is clear, fresh, original-sounding music

that's easy to listen to and sometimes teaches you something about your world, your fellow man or even yourself. It's the kind of music that just makes you feel good.

"IF I HAD TO put a name on it," Cohan said, "I would say it's melodic pop with a hard edge and thoughtful lyrics."

Scarecrow's music spans the Latin-flavored, danceable and humorous "Psychology" to the romantic and mellow "Out There." On the latter

tune the beautiful and full voice of Millett is accompanied by pretty keyboards and a very Top-40 style (this tune is too good to stay in the closet).

Songs like "Before" and "Taffy Pull" have the rawness and off-tempo beat of old black-and-white silent movies or Blondie and Dagwood shows. It's these Scarecrow songs that create the fun feeling and summer-time excitement of old Beach Boy tunes.

The friendly lyrics and smooth harmonies of "Welcome to My House"

remind the listener of the acoustic group America but still have that Scarecrow originality. We can't leave out the extremely contagious tenor sax solo at the end of "We Got Trouble" and innovative sound effects such as those in "Do You Know Where Your Children Are?"

Hopefully, Scarecrow will be bringing its brand of exciting music to the public soon. "Keep your ears open," said Millett who's anxious for the public to join in on the fun. "We'll be around pretty soon."

## Cool concert band sound has double life

"Gems of the Concert Band," Vol. 4, Detroit Concert Band directed by Leonard B. Smith; \$9.10 by mail order.

We band fans get double duty out of the newest full-length concert-type recording of the venerable Detroit Concert Band.

First, The Boomer and I can enjoy works of great classical composers by ourselves. The Boomer is my 13-year-old poodle who likes cool sounds — the woodwind music of Mozart and Haydn, the clean, clear sounds of the DCB. He slinks from the room when Paganini violin caprices or crash-bang Tchaikovsky opuses are played. We both slink from the room when rock is played.

The Boomer and I used to share a Belle Isle park bench when the DCB played there, until a few summers ago. Those concerts are no more. So we rejoiced when the band began a 36-album series of recordings documenting "the mainstream of American concert band traditional literature."

THE SECOND way to enjoy this LP is as a party record among music lovers, comparing DCB's versions of the classics to other recordings.

Example: Earle Louder performs

### review

Adolphe Adam's "Bravura Variations" on the French nursery song we know as "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star." Louder does it on the euphonium, a brass cousin of the baritone and tuba horns, for goodness' sake.

Well, I have the same work on another recording sung by the late Mado Robin, "the stratospheric coloratura." The comparison may strike you as bizarre, but each version works.

Or there's the Strauss waltz "Accelerations," one of my favorites. Until I heard the DCB recording, I would have doubted it could be transcribed from zinging strings to a concert band arrangement. But again it works.

As The Boomer says: "Artists will be artists — even when they're chewing on each other's old bones."

VOL. 4 is a typical Smith "interesting and varied program."

Classics are represented by Saint-Saens' "Marche Militaire Francaise," Rachmaninoff's "Italian Polka" and Glazunov's valse and bacchanale from "The Seasons." The bacchanale, as I recall, was theme music for the old radio program about Sgt. King and his

dog Preston, or something like that.

Standard concert band fare includes Panella's "American Red Cross" march, Ernest Williams' cornet trio "The Three Bluejackets" (featuring Smith, Ned Mahoney and Frank Elsass, all students of the composer), Smith's own "Town Crier" march (dedicated to Mark Beltaire of the Free Press) and Paul Van Loan's "Leonard B. Smith" march, all topped off by Gershwin's "Liza."

Program notes by Mary Lou Hornberger are concise and informative,

complete with the dates of all composers with one exception: It lists no birth date for Dr. Smith.

The Detroit Concert Band will begin a series of 15 free-to-the-public concerts at 7:30 p.m. July 7 at the Michigan State Fair Grounds in Detroit.

That night the fair grounds band shell will be dedicated as "The John Philip Sousa Band Shell" — with John Philip Sousa III, grandson of the March King arriving from New York City to participate in the ceremonies.
