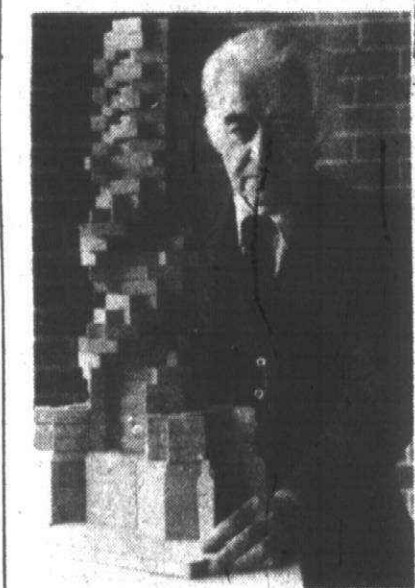

Canton OKs battered-women shelter

Building, funding deadlines loom

Canton has given conditional approval for First Step agency to refurbish a house to shelter battered women and children.

In 1980, Canton applied for a \$60,000 grant from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in behalf of First Step, an agency helping battered women. The funds would provide temporary housing for women seeking refuge and a chance for a fresh start.

The grant was approved, but no money was spent because First Step was unable to find a suitable, affordable building. Now the agency has found a house large enough to shelter six women and 12 children.

The location, in western Wayne County, is unpublicized to protect the occupants. The women stay an average of 14 days while mapping solutions to their problems, said First Step director Gayle Mattson-Croninger.

Renovations will bring the house up to code, and safety devices will be installed, she added. Canton's Township Board gave approval last week for First Step to begin refurbishing, provided Canton isn't held liable for expenses not covered by the \$60,000 grant.

WHILE SUPPORTING the proposed shelter as "essential," board members

expressed concerns about deadlines set by federal and state agencies which support First Step.

"If they're not in there (the shelter) by Oct. 1, the state funding is jeopardized," said Terry Carroll, grants coordinator. "There is a Dec. 31, 1982 deadline to spend the federal funds."

First Step, established in 1979, offers counseling, legal and financial assistance to women physically abused by husbands or live-in boy friends.

The agency charges no fees to clients. One third of First Step's funding comes from the domestic violence board, through the state Department of Social Services.

Other funding comes from federal and local grants, fund-raising efforts and donations. Supervisor James Poole hopes to meet with representatives of the state officials, and the county representative for HUD.

"That's what we're trying to clarify — what deadlines, established by whom?" said Poole. "If you can't meet the deadline, why start it? I don't want to spend any money — whether it's state or federal — if it isn't going to accomplish something."

UNDER THE plan, First Step will hire contractors to bring the shelter up to building codes, install safety win-

dows, alarms and other security measures.

Bills will be submitted to Canton for payment. Reimbursement will come through the local HUD representatives in the Wayne County Office of Inter-Governmental Affairs and Management, explained Carroll.

Carroll said he believes the \$60,000 grant will enable First Step to obtain an occupancy certificate for the shelter. Other grants or donations could pay additional expenses.

First Step serves about 80 new clients per month throughout western Wayne County, said Mattson-Croninger.

Local police departments have referred many battered women to the

BESIDES HAVING his/her entry printed in the Observer, the winner also will receive \$50.

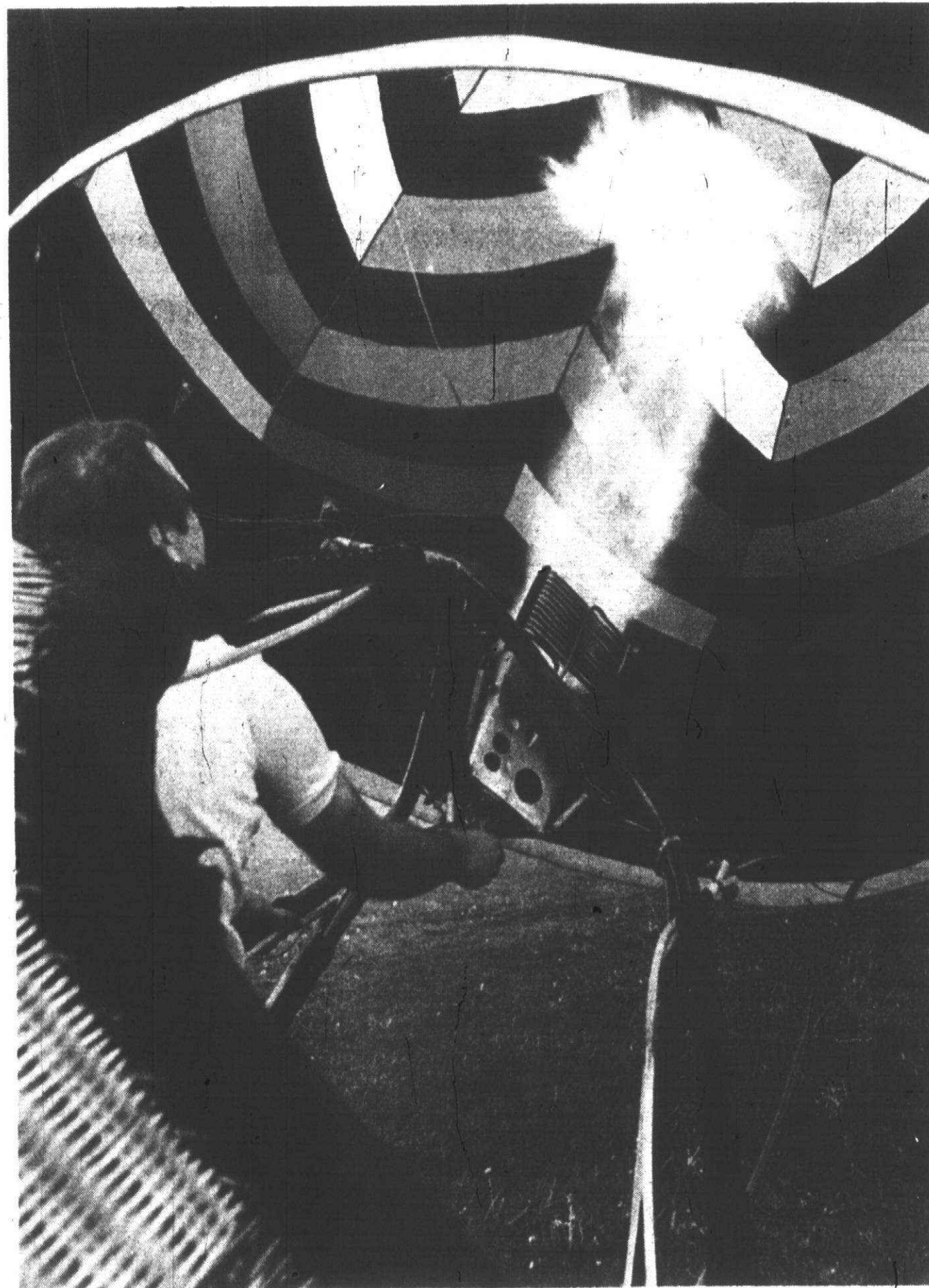
The runner-up will receive \$25 plus Sunday dinner for two at the Mayflower Hotel.

New events added to second annual air balloon festival

A number of new events have been added to the 1982 Mayflower Hot Air Balloon Festival to be held in Plymouth July 9-11.

Among the changes is the shift in location of the launching site to the spacious Plymouth Township Park at Ann Arbor Trail and McClumpus Road about 1.5 miles west of the city.

Another will be an increase in the number of hot air balloons entering the festivities, as some 30 are signed up this far.

The festival is sponsored by the Mayflower Hotel in conjunction with Gordon Boring of the Wicker Basket Balloon Center and by more than 20 businesses.

The balloons will ascend from the township park at about 6 p.m. Friday, July 9, and at about 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

The 30-plus balloons will be visible in the sky from nearly every point in Plymouth, Canton and Northville.

DURING THE festival, many competitive events and crowd-participation activities are held.

The first event Friday is British Airways' "Hare and Hounds" Race in which a lead balloon (the hare) takes off and 10 minutes or so later the rest of the balloons (the hounds) take off and try to follow the exact flight of the hare.

The balloon landing closest to the hare will win a trip for two to England via British Airways.

Saturday will begin with a sunrise flight with the sponsors aboard. At the end of the sponsors' flight the pilot and passengers break open the traditional champagne and toast the flight.

By 8 a.m. Saturday the festival will focus on downtown Plymouth at the Farmer's Market, where visitors can shop for fresh produce and flowers. Then the Chamber of Commerce will

host the Art in the Park display, where artists and craftsmen will be displaying their works for sale in Kellogg Park.

NEARBY CAR dealers will be showing off their 1983 models in conjunction with the Plymouth Community Federal Credit Union.

In celebration of the balloon festival, local merchants are planning special balloon sales and events, and storefronts will be decorated throughout the downtown area highlighting the balloon-race theme.

More than 60 merchants are participating in the balloon sales Wednesday through Saturday. Beyond sales, merchants also will have a variety of balloon games and contests.

Some 1,200 helium-filled balloons carrying special offers from participating stores will be launched from the Mayflower II parking deck on Tuesday, July 6.

A grand prize of a fantasy trip for two for four days and two nights to the Albuquerque, N.M., International Hot Air Balloon Festival will be awarded to a customer. The trip is provided through Eastern Airlines and Plymouth Travel Consultants.

THE THIRD FLIGHT on Saturday evening will be a C.N.T. race sponsored by Eastern Airlines.

The winner of this race will receive three round-trip tickets to Disney World in Orlando, Fla., via Eastern Airlines.

During the C.N.T. Race, balloons take off three to five miles upwind of a target and attempt to fly over it. As the balloons pass, a marker is dropped. The pilot whose marker lands closest to the target wins.

Courts, cops share ideas

A "dialogue" program at the 35th District Court continues to be a success, three years after it began.

Serving Plymouth Township, Canton Township, Northville and Northville Township, the court must work with more police departments than any other Wayne County district court.

The 35th processes violations for each of the local police departments, the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and the Michigan State Police.

Most district courts only process for one local police department and possibly the sheriff or state police, said

George Wiland, 35th court administrator.

Because the 35th works with seven law enforcement agencies (Plymouth police patrol, Plymouth Township, cooperation between the court and police is important, said Wiland.

SO EVERY six to eight weeks, Wiland invites the police chiefs to lunch to share ideas.

"We never wanted to meet on a regular basis. We wanted to make sure there was something to talk about," said Wiland.

"We know they have problems with the court and likewise we have problems with them — if there's positive

dialogue, we can do something about it."

The program, started by Judge James Garber, is well received by the police departments.

"We have our problems with the court, but there isn't a department which doesn't. With the 35th, we sit down and talk about the problems and get an understanding of why things are the way they are," said Canton Lt. Larry Stewart.

THE STATE police obviously approve of the meetings, too — they recently presented Wiland with an award for the meetings.

Court, police chiefs keep sharing ideas

"For us to sit down at a common table and discuss problems is a great benefit," said Lt. William Tomczyk, commander of the state police Northville Post.

"We have some courts that say this is going to be the way it is and aren't flexible. The 35th bends over backwards to try and accommodate us."

The Northville Post works with 13 district courts.

"The 35th is the only court which has this type of meeting for the police departments," said Tomczyk.

ONE OF THE biggest benefits for the court has been a reduction in court time, said Wiland.

"The quality of the tickets has improved," he said.

A quality ticket is one the accused violator probably won't contest in

court because the ticket is complete and accurate.

"We use to have a lot of tickets which were being brought to court and then dismissed. A better ticket cuts down on court time — we aren't using up our time on minor traffic offenses," said Wiland.

But the court isn't the only benefactor of the meetings. The police departments are given considerations in return for their cooperation.

"THE MEETINGS have helped the department solve its problems in regards to man hours. We have been able to minimize the amount of time our officers spend in court," said Plymouth Police Chief Carl Berry.

"The courts have been working with us in notifying our officers when they are needed. By giving our officers better notice, it has less effect on their off-duty time and home life," said Berry.

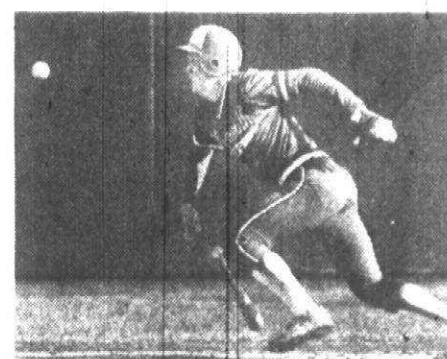
Despite the setback, it marked the third time in the last five years that Canton baseball teams have reached the final four in state tournament competition.

This season, Canton got past that semifinal jinx with a 10-2 thrashing of Warren Cousino — before bowing to Midland in the finale.

In all three cases, Canton lost to the eventual state champion.

The Chiefs' tournament performances against the state's very best are something to be proud of.



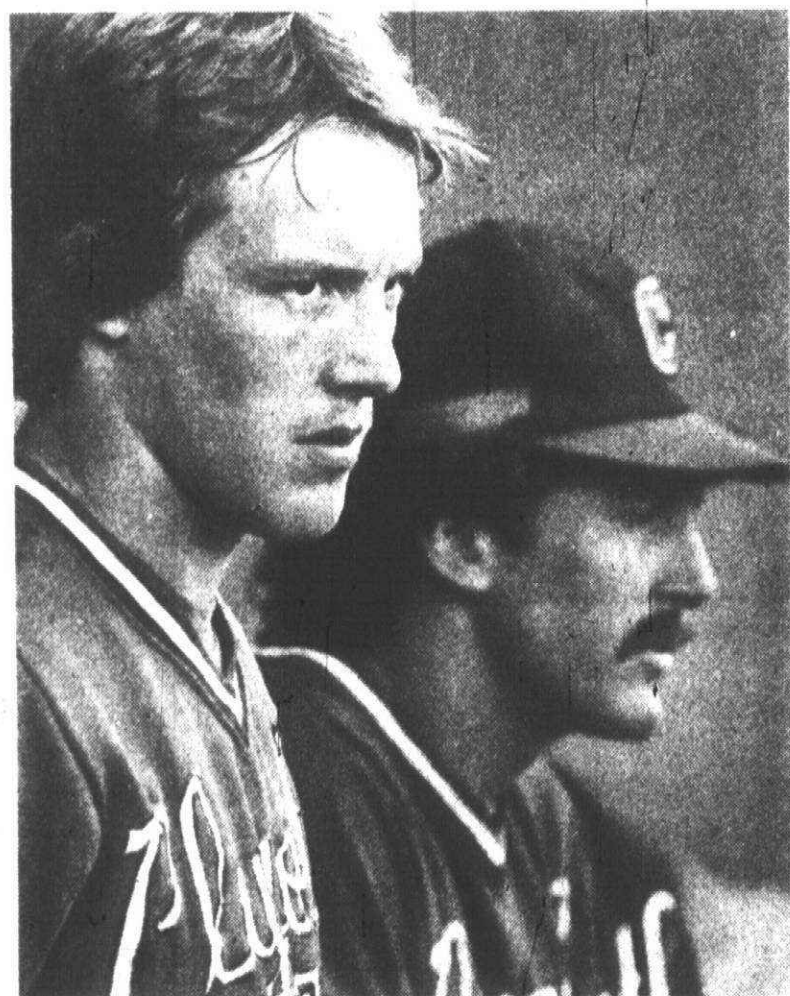

THE SUNDAY-MORNING flight will be a mass ascent and fun fly for the balloonists.

The pilots and crews will meet for breakfast at the Balloon Brunch in the Mayflower Meeting House beginning at 9 a.m. Horse and carriage rides will be given to all patrons by Banbury Cross Horse and Carriage Service.

Sunday afternoon the activities planned include an antique car show, a children's fishing derby, and a kite-flying contest sponsored by Plymouth Travel.

The Sunday evening flight will be a "pick 'em up key" contest. Balloonists will launch three miles from the township park and attempt to pick up keys from atop poles to win the use of brand-new automobiles, courtesy of

Don Massey Cadillac and Dick Scott Buick.

LAST YEAR, 8,000 spectators watched as one balloon flew within 15 feet of a pole, just missing the keys.

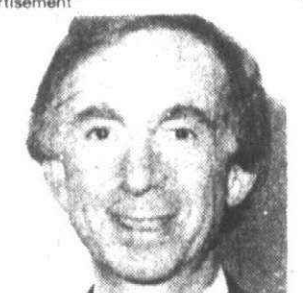

THE CANTILEVER BRIDGE

The best way to replace a missing tooth (or teeth) is by anchoring the artificial replacements to natural teeth on both sides — just like a bridge over a river is supported on both shores.

There are some specific situations, however, where a bridge can be attached to only one adjacent tooth. This is called a cantilevered bridge. Such a bridge is most often found in the front of the mouth. Back teeth, used for grinding and subject to tremendous strain (often over 300 pounds per square inch) are poorer risks for the cantilever bridge. The front teeth, used for cutting, suffer much less pressure (about 75 pounds per square inch). Since front teeth are not employed for grinding, they can more readily chance carrying the load of the replacement tooth with only one tooth supporting it.

However, cantilever bridges are occasionally used in the back of the mouth, mostly when the missing tooth is the farthest tooth back. The dentist may attach it to two, three or even four teeth in front of the space (the more supporting teeth, the stronger the cantilever) to support it.

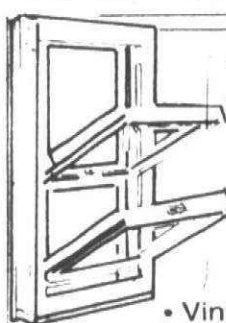

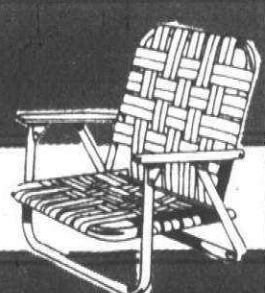

Deputy dissents on editorial

To the editor:

The recent column by Gary M. Cates "Sheriff's patrol opting to drive law enforcement road alone?" (Observer June 21) makes me wonder about the objectivity of your paper and the amount of effort your reporters put into researching a column.

Not only is Cates misinformed about much of what he set forth in his article, he went so far as to attribute a statement to me, and to the best of my knowledge, I have never met or talked with him in my life nor did I make the statement to anyone.

Taking the statements made by Cates in the order he presented them, he first implied that the Wayne County Sheriff's Department had been negligent in not filing required reports to obtain funding for its state-financed traffic safety program.

Quoting from the article: "To collect the money, the Sheriff's Department must file a quarterly report and OCJP (state Office of Criminal Justice Programs) sends off a check for a portion of the grant."

HAD CATES stopped to think, even if he had not carefully researched his story, he would have realized that no county agency funds itself or arranges for its own financing. Billing and collection of funds are handled by the Wayne County Board of Auditors, and the report he referred to does not even have a place for the Sheriff or his representative to co-sign, much less sign.

When I checked on the status of the report, I found that it had been filed by

the Wayne County Board of Auditors on June 8, 1982. Currently, as has been the case since this grant was begun in 1979, all reports which are the responsibility of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department have been properly filed.

Taking the matter one step further, according to OCJP, so long as no claim is made after the close of the fiscal year, that agency is not concerned with when funding requests are made.

BY THE tone of his column, and the title itself, Cates implies that the Sheriff's Department has refused to cooperate with, or accept assistance from other departments: "Plymouth Police Chief Carl Berry has offered his breathalyzer, lock-up facilities and cooperation to the Sheriff. However, he has not been taken up on it. Canton Police and the Michigan State Police in Northville both report the same thing. Yet Sgt. Brown, the Deputy Patrol supervisor, claims the deputies use the local breathalyzer. Somebody's got some wrong information."

The offer of assistance made by Chief Berry was made at a meeting I had requested with him to discuss what each of our agencies could do to assist the other. Subsequent to that meeting, the Sheriff's legal adviser directed that no prisoner arrested by a deputy sheriff, on a charge initiated by him, would be turned over to another agency.

The reason for this ruling was the possibility of a lawsuit which could arise because of a circumstance over which the Sheriff's Department could have no control after custody of the prisoner had been given up. So far as use of the breathalyzers, it has been more convenient so far, to use our own. I have stated to no one that we are currently using local breathalyzers.

CATES' STATEMENT that an officer driving by an accident scene and not stopping was a "clinger" was apparently based upon a misunderstanding by a Sheriff's officer. The officer, seeing three Plymouth patrol cars at the scene, assumed that the situation was under control and continued on with his duties. A minor problem such as this one could have been resolved with a phone call, and to publish it in a newspaper seems to me to be more in the line of nit picking than editorializing.

Cates concluded his column by declaring that "Local police departments have been asking for assistance in Hines Park. (Wayne County Sheriff William) Lucas won't patrol the park. Lucas claims it's too dangerous to send his men into Hines Park."

Daily, members of the Secondary Roads Patrol work alone on all shifts, relying upon a radio system that has not been maintained or serviced in more than a year and which has deteriorated to the point that it does not even work in certain areas of the county.

THE POINT-TO-POINT capability that allows one department to call upon another by radio when it has an officer in trouble was lost when the Sheriff's Department was denied the use of its former headquarters over one year ago.

By working as they do, these officers assume greater risks than most officers would be willing to accept on a daily basis, and to imply that because Sheriff Lucas chooses not to expose his

officers to danger greater than the inordinate amount they already face that either he or his officers refuse to accept the danger of police work insults the integrity of the entire department.

Had Cates fully quoted statements made by Sheriff Lucas, his article would have gone on to say that the moment the radio system of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department is brought up to a standard that allows an officer who is being assaulted by a mob to call for help from other departments, as officers from other departments working the park are now able to do, Sheriff Lucas will move his officers into Edward Hines Park.

The Wayne County Sheriff's Department is well aware of the need for cooperation among police agencies at a time when crime is on a steady rise and law enforcement ranks have been decimated by budget cuts. As we have always done, we will continue to share the law enforcement load.

The gamble Bradner and Waterman took in '62

(Part XIII)

On March 6, 1961, on his way back to Bay City from Washington, D.C., Dr. Eric Bradner stopped off in Livonia at the old Newburgh School. He had been asked to meet with the executive committee that was trying to establish a community college in this area.

At the meeting, Bradner was offered and accepted the job as coordinator of the college drive, a position which Dr. Albert Ammerman had vacated.

To accept the position, Bradner got a leave of absence from Bay City Junior College with the understanding that he was expected to enter into a contract with the newly formed Delta College late in 1961.

When the June 1961 election to establish Schoolcraft College failed because of the defection of the two Redford school districts, Bradner and his wife retired to the north woods where he began to prepare for his coming work with Delta.

In July, however, he received a phone call from Harold Fischer asking him to return to the Newburgh School. The committee had now reorganized into four school districts and was going to make a second try at establishing the college.

WHEN THE SECOND VOTE was a

success, Bradner was offered the presidency of the college.

Now he and his wife had to make an important decision. His position with Delta College was a sure thing. But here he was being offered a possible, but not necessarily probable, position in a college that might not get funded. He was then 55. If he passed up the Delta position, and the millage to establish Schoolcraft was turned down, he would find it difficult at that age to obtain a comparable position.

The Bradners thought it over and decided to take the gamble. He accepted the job as founding president of Schoolcraft College. Now Bradner had more than one reason for doing all in his power to make sure that the third vote (the millage election) to be held late that year was a success.

Having explained why Bradner pondered a week before accepting the presidency of the college, I return to the Jan. 24, 1962, meeting of the board at

which he made his acceptance speech. It was at that meeting that the trustees set September 1964 as the target date for opening the college.

During the two-and-two-third years interval between those dates, the board and the new college president had to secure the funds, decide on a site, recruit a staff and faculty, develop rules and regulations, attract a student body, and construct the buildings. It was a challenge of the first order.

In February, the board spent an entire day with representatives of five architectural firms. Each firm was given 90 minutes to make its presentation. On Feb. 14, the trustees approved a rate of one mill for the election, which was scheduled for June 11. Even if the millage passed, tax money would not begin

to come until January 1963. Meantime, the board had to pay Bradner's salary and other expenses from funds loaned to it by the various school boards which had been sustaining the effort from the very beginning.

ANOTHER PERSON WHO gambled that Schoolcraft would succeed was Lois L. Waterman.

Early in 1962, after his appointment as president, Bradner had attempted to get Waterman to join his administrative staff. Waterman, whom he had known at Delta College where she was dean of students, at first said no. Bradner got board member Jane Moehle to go to Bay City with him to visit Waterman, and between the two of them they persuaded her to make the move.

On March 1, 1962, Waterman met with the board of trustees to be interviewed for the position of dean of student affairs. Her appointment was announced April 30.

Waterman had earned her bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Michigan and had studied at Col-

umbia University, the University of Denver and the University of Wisconsin. She had been associate dean at Chatham College in Pittsburgh before joining Delta. She is said to have been a big factor in getting Schoolcraft off on the right track.

Waterman established and defined the courses, developed the counseling staff, helped interpret curricula to the architects, and made agreements with colleges and universities in Michigan so that when Schoolcraft College opened, its students would have no difficulty in transferring.

Bradner depended heavily on her. In recent correspondence I had with him (he now lives in Scottsdale, Ariz.), Bradner refers to Waterman as "in all respects, the founder of the quality of the college."

When I spoke to Waterman recently, she said she joined the proposed college "not for financial reasons, but because it was an intellectual challenge, something new to be done."

She remembers the many talks she gave to service and other clubs in the area, explaining the purposes of the college and answering the questions that inevitably arose during the founding years.

Titan grad recalls days on gridiron

The name plate on the rural mail box read:

Joe Beer, M.D.
Behind it lay a beautiful estate with a house that resembled a mansion of the old days and a lawn that would have been envied even in the Emerald Isle.

And still further on, as far as the eye could see, was the beauty of Lake Huron on one of its better days.

Surely, this could not be the home of the young fellow from Detroit's east side who accepted a football scholarship to attend the University of Detroit 50 years ago and became one of its sports greats by the time he graduated.

BUT THERE was no doubt when he answered the bell to greet the visitor.

"Well, if it isn't my old friend," said the man with the slightly gray beard and mustache and a large bald spot. He stuck out his hand in greeting.

Ushered into the living room of this mansion where the walls were covered with the most beautiful of pictures and paintings, we spent one of

the finest afternoons of a recent vacation.

"I don't recall how long ago it was that I last saw you," he said, "but it sure is a thrill for me to be with my old newspaper buddy of my football days."

He took a few moments to reveal the high points of his life since graduating from college. He later attended Wayne State Medical School, opened an office in St. Clair in 1938 and then retired with a medical service record of 35 years.

"THINGS WERE getting complicated in the medical field, and I thought it best to get out."

At the time, he was one of the top members of the staff at the River District Hospital in St. Clair, but he

longed for a rest.

"I delivered about 2,500 babies during my career, and I just figured it was time to leave it all behind. So I came up here."

With his medical record reviewed, he turned to his days in football when the University of Detroit was gaining prestige under the coaching of Gus Dorais and Bud Boeringer.

"I made the tackle position. And because we had a small squad, a fellow had to stay in there and take his bumps no matter what happened."

"That was bad enough, but I had invited three members of the team and line coach Boeringer over to my mother's house for Thanksgiving dinner."

"But as I look back now, it was great fun, and traveling with you helped to make my football travels a memorable journey."

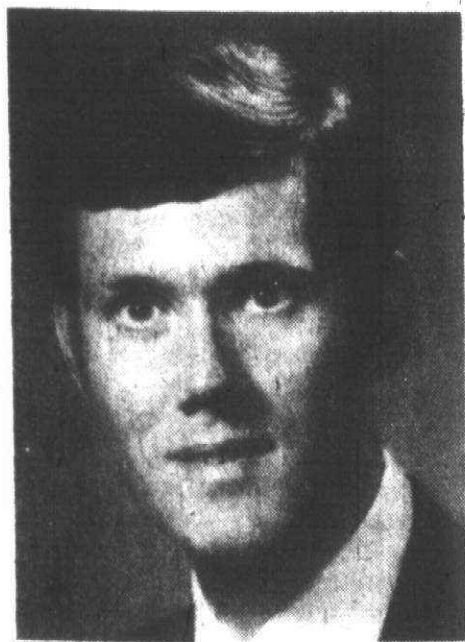

Libertarian files for House seat

Keith Z. Bilby, 26, has announced his candidacy as a Libertarian candidate for the Michigan House in the newly created 36th District.

Bilby, 26, of 42489 Lakeland, Plymouth, is running in a district which includes all of the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township, half of Canton, and both Northvilles.

An engineer for Detroit Diesel Allison, Bilby called for reductions in all state taxes — particularly the property tax and the Single Business Tax.

"I used to complain about taxes and big government. This year I'm going to do something about it," he said.

"If the people of Canton, Plymouth and Northville have heard enough excuses about why their taxes can't be cut, then together we can make a big impression on the Republicans and Democrats in November."

Bilby, who is making his first try at elective office, was nominated at the Libertarian State Convention in May. He will not be listed on the ballot in the August primary but will be on the general election ballot in November if the Libertarian Party gathers enough votes statewide in August to qualify for the ballot.

Born in Traverse City, Bilby earned a bachelor of science degree in engineering from the University of Michigan in 1979 and was a member of the Michigan Band. He attended public schools in Jackson, where his parents now live.

He has served on the state central committee of the Libertarian Party. His interests include running, skiing, boating, reading, and listening to music.

The Libertarian Party's basic principles are that "all individuals have the right to exercise sole dominion over their own lives, and have the right to live in whatever manner they choose, so long as they do not forcibly interfere with the equal rights of others to live in whatever manner they choose."

"Governments throughout history have regularly operated on the opposite principle, that the state has the right to dispose of the lives of individuals and the fruits of their labor. Even within the U.S., all political parties other than our own grant to government the right to regulate the lives of individuals and seize the fruits of their labor without their consent."

Specifically, Libertarians support the Right to Life, freedom of speech, press and action, the right to property, and freedom in the marketplace.

State Senate OKs strip mining bill

The Michigan Senate has overwhelmingly approved a bill giving the state authority to regulate any future strip mining.

Senate Majority Leader William Faust, D-Westland, the bill's sponsor, said it is necessary to protect Michigan's environment from the potentially damaging effects of strip mining. Mineral rights to thousands of acres in Michigan's coal basin have been purchased in recent months by oil and coal companies.

"With today's rising energy costs,

coal is once again becoming economically attractive," said Faust. "Michigan's Mine Reclamation Act is one of the weakest in the country and lacks nearly every one of the standards and requirements of the tougher, federal law."

IF MINING operations began in Michigan tomorrow, they would be regulated only by federal interim regulations.

Faust said federal regulations fail to require permits, performance bonds or

restoration of mined land to its previous condition.

"With recent federal cutbacks in the U.S. Office of Surface Mining and the Reagan administration's backing of increased development, it is more important than ever that we enact this legislation to preserve our environment," said Faust.

FAUST'S SB 819 would establish complete state statutory authority over

surface coal mining and reclamation operations. The bill's provision include:

- Detailed permit procedures for surface coal mining, including post-mining reclamation plans.

- Detailed environmental performance standards and requirements that mined land be restored to at least its condition prior to mining.

- A minimum performance bond of \$20,000 for the permit area.

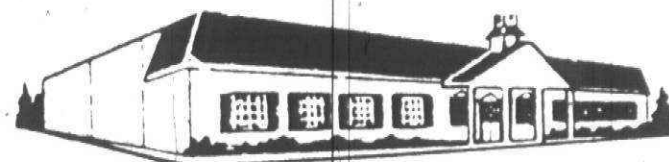

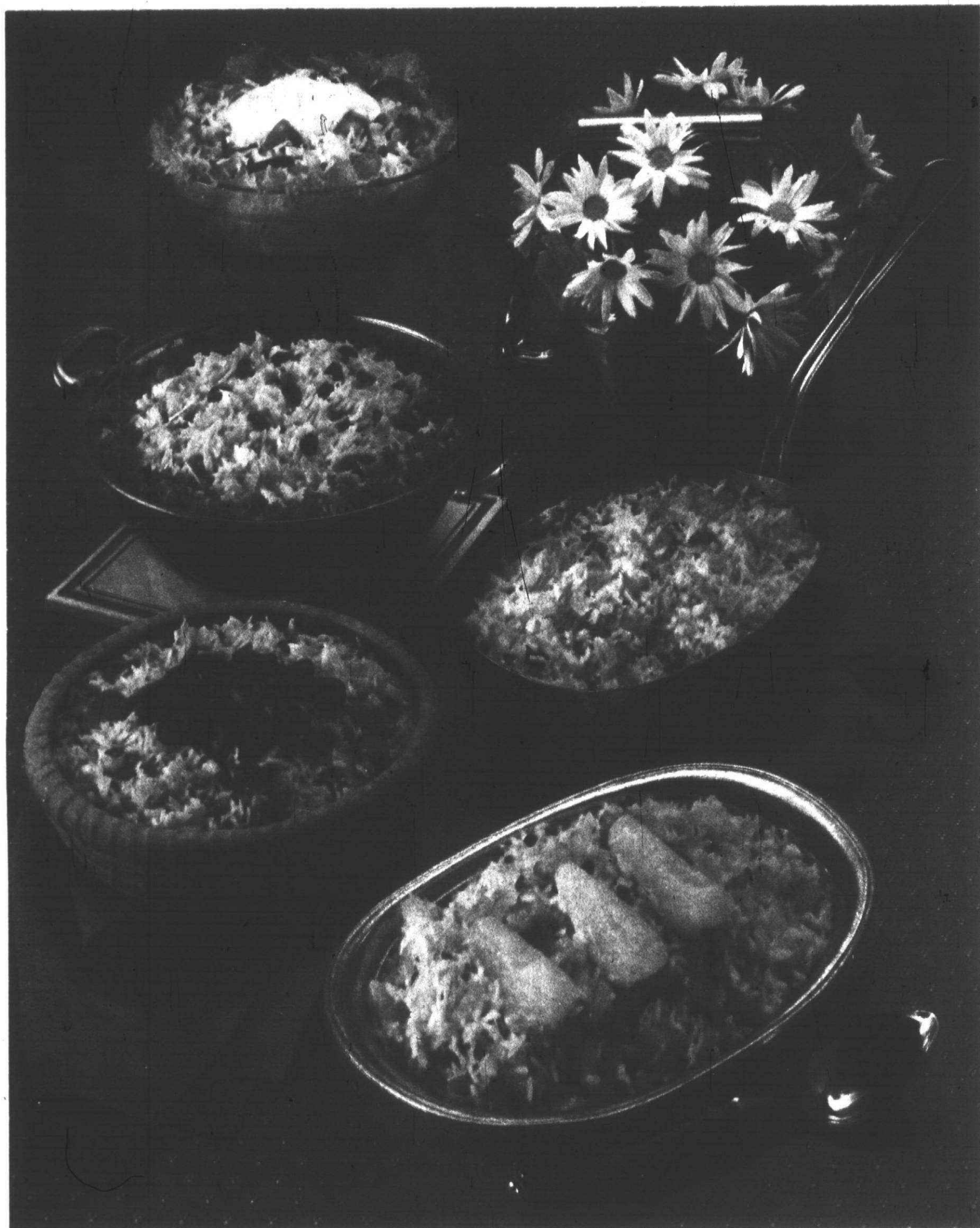

Hot German Rice Salad

6 slices bacon, cut in 1/4-inch pieces
1/2 cup finely chopped onions
1/4 cup cider vinegar
3 tablespoons sugar
2 tablespoons water
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper
4 cups cooked rice
1 small carrot, grated
2 tablespoons snipped parsley

In large skillet cook bacon until crisp. Pour off fat; return 2 tablespoons to skillet. Add onions, vinegar, sugar, water, salt, and pepper. Cook until onions are tender. Stir in rice, carrot, and parsley. Heat through, about 5 minutes. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

Herbed Vegetable Rice

1/2 cup green onions, including tops

1 clove garlic, minced

Winning essay expresses thanks to JA

Peter Schaldenbrand, an eighth grader at Our Lady of Good Counsel, won the Junior Achievement-sponsored essay/speech contest. He presented his speech, "What Project Business Means to Me," to 400 business leaders and educators at the annual Project Business recognition dinner.

Project Business is designed to provide students with information which will make them aware of the American economic process. Members of the business community visit the classrooms as consultants. These volunteers visit the classrooms on a weekly basis for one semester, working in coordination with the teacher.

This was the second year Rose Marie Shilcusk, teacher at OLCG, had taken advantage of the project offered by Junior Achievement.

She divided her eighth graders into two classes of 22 students for Project Business. Dr. Ronald Hurley of Ford Motor Co. was the consultant for one group; Bob Ervin was consultant for the second.

PETER WAS in Ervin's group. The consultant is a member of OLCG parish and a retiree after working 25 years for Parke-Davis.

Peter described, in his prize-winning essay/speech, his doubts while waiting for the first class to start. He said that weeks later, he had learned how businesses struggle to survive, how companies compete and are victorious or crushed. He learned about sudden rises and sharp drops in the stock market.

He concluded: "Americans are always rushing their own separate ways, but one group of Americans found time to help the youth — Project Business. For your part in introducing me to your world, I thank you."

His class had studied personal banking, the basic economic systems — communism, socialism and free enterprise. They studied the stock market and were involved in a game for several weeks in which they invested in the market. They learned about consumerism and advertising — how to recognize the propaganda technique.

DURING THE COURSE the class made several field trips and learned about job opportunities in the area.

They visited the Kroger plant in Livonia, St. Joseph's Hospital in Ann Arbor, Guardian Industries in Novi, and two local banks.

They also did comparison shopping to better understand consumerism.

Project Business is available to all middle school students in the Detroit Metropolitan area. It began as a pilot program in 1977. Last year more than 6,000 students in 216 classes in southeastern Michigan were involved in the project.

Peter Schaldenbrand said it made him proud of the American way of doing things. In the fall, he will attend Catholic Central High School where he hopes to participate in debating. He says that at this point, he has no definite career plans.

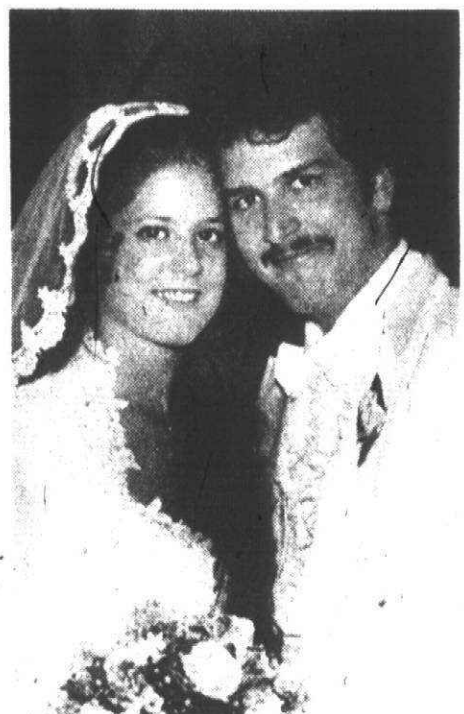

CITY OF PLYMOUTH MICHIGAN

ORDINANCE 82-8

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER, WHICH NEW CHAPTER SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS CHAPTER 120, PRECIOUS METAL AND GEM DEALERS, OF TITLE IX OF SAID CODE

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Section 1. This ordinance shall be known and shall be cited as the Precious Metal and Gem Dealers Ordinance, and shall provide regulation for the business of buying and receiving gold, silver, platinum, gems, jewelry, and other precious items, shall provide powers to the Police Department with respect to such regulation; shall provide for the registration of precious metal and gem dealers; shall provide for civil damages; and shall prescribe penalties.

Section 2. As used in this ordinance:

- "Agent or employee" means a person who, for compensation or valuable consideration, is employed either directly or indirectly by a dealer.
- "Dealer" means any person, corporation, partnership, or association, which, in whole or in part, engages in the ordinary course of repeated and recurrent transactions of buying or receiving precious items from the public within the City.
- "Gold" means elemental gold having an atomic weight of 196.967 and the chemical element symbol of Au, whether found by itself or in combination with its alloys or any other metal.
- "Jewelry" means an ornamental item made of a material that includes a precious gem.
- "Platinum" means elemental platinum having an atomic weight of 195.09, and the chemical element symbol of Pt, whether found by itself or in combination with its alloys or any other metal.
- "Precious gem" means a diamond, alexandrite, ruby, sapphire, opal, amethyst, emerald, aquamarine, morganite, garnet, jadeite, topaz, tourmaline, turquoise, or pearl.
- "Precious item" means jewelry, a precious gem, or an item containing gold, silver, or platinum. Precious items do not include the following:
 - Coins, commemorative medals, and tokens struck by, or in behalf of, a government or private mint, unless they contain precious metals as defined herein.
 - Bullion bars and discs of the type traded by banks and commodity exchanges.
 - Items at the time they are purchased directly from a dealer registered under this ordinance, a manufacturer, or a wholesaler who purchased them directly from a manufacturer.
 - Industrial machinery or equipment.
 - An item being returned to or exchanged at the dealer where the item was purchased and which is accompanied by a valid sales receipt.
 - An item which is received for alteration, redesign, or repair in a manner that does not substantially change its use and returned directly to the customer.
 - An item which does not have a jeweler's identifying mark or a serial mark and which the dealer purchases for less than \$5.00.
 - Scrap metal which contains incidental traces of gold, silver, or platinum which are recoverable as a by-product.
 - Jewelry which a customer trades for other jewelry having a greater value, and which difference in value is paid by the customer.
 - "Silver" means elemental silver having an atomic weight of 107.869 and the chemical element symbol of Ag, whether found by itself or in combination with its alloys or any other metal.

Section 3.

- A dealer shall not conduct business in the City of Plymouth unless the dealer has obtained a valid Certificate of Registration from the City of Plymouth.
- A dealer shall apply to the Plymouth Police Department for a Certificate of Registration, and pay a fee not to exceed \$50.00 to cover the reasonable cost of processing and issuing the Certificate of Registration, by disclosing the following information:
 - The name, address, and thumbprint of the applicant.
 - The name and address under which the applicant does business.
 - The name, address, and thumbprint of all agents or employees of the dealer. Within 24 hours after hiring a new employee, the dealer shall forward to the Police Department the name, address, and thumbprint of the new employee.
- A dealer or an agent or employee of a dealer who is convicted of a misdemeanor under this ordinance or under Section 535 of Act 328 of the Public Acts of 1931, as amended, being Section 750.535 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, shall not be permitted to operate as a dealer within this City for a period of one year after conviction.
- Upon receipt of the application described in Subsection (2), the Police Department shall issue a Certificate of Registration in accordance with this section.
- Upon receipt of the Certificate of Registration from the Police Department, the dealer shall post it in a conspicuous place in the dealer's place of business.
- Not less than ten days before a dealer changes the name or address under which the dealer does business, the dealer shall notify the Police Department of the change.

Section 4.

- A dealer shall maintain a permanent record of each transaction on Record of Transaction forms, legibly written in ink. Each Record of Transaction form

shall be filled out in triplicate by the dealer or agent or employee of the dealer, with one copy going to the Police Department, pursuant to Section 3, one copy going to the customer, and one copy to be retained by the dealer. At the time a dealer receives or purchases a precious item, the dealer or agent or employee of the dealer shall insure that the following information is recorded accurately on a Record of Transaction Form:

- The dealer Certificate of Registration number.
 - A general description of the precious item or precious items received or purchased, including its type of metal or precious gem. In the case of watches, the description shall contain the number of the maker and the number of both the works and the case. In the case of jewelry, all letters and marks inscribed on the jewelry shall be included in the description.
 - The date of the transaction.
 - The name of the person conducting the transaction.
 - The name, date of birth, driver's license number or State of Michigan personal identification card number, and street and house number of the person with whom the transaction is being made, together with a legible imprint of the right thumb of the person with whom the transaction is made, or if that is not possible, then the left thumb or a finger of that person. However, the thumbprint or fingerprint shall only be required on the Record of Transaction form retained by the dealer. The thumbprint or fingerprint shall be made available to the Police Department only during the course of a police investigation involving a precious item or items described on the Record of Transaction. After a period of one year from the date of the Record of Transaction, if a police investigation concerning a precious item or items described on the record of transaction has not occurred, the dealer and Police Department may destroy, and not keep a permanent record of, the records of transaction. A dealer who goes out of business or changes his or her business address to another local jurisdiction either within or out of this State shall transmit the records of all transactions made by the dealer within one year before his or her closing or moving, to the Police Department.
 - The price to be paid by the dealer for the previous item or precious items.
 - The form of payment made to the customer: check, money order, bank draft, or cash. If the payment is by check, money order, or bank draft, the dealer shall indicate the number of the check, money order, or bank draft.
 - The customer's signature.
- The record of each transaction shall be numbered consecutively, commencing with the number 1 and the calendar year.
 - Within 48 hours after receiving or purchasing a precious item, the dealer shall send a copy of the Record of Transaction form to the Police Department. The Record of Transaction forms received by the Police Department shall not be open to inspection by the general public. The Police Department shall be responsible for insuring the confidentiality of the Record of Transaction forms and insuring that the Record of Transaction forms are used only for the purpose for which they were received.
 - The Record of Transaction forms of a dealer and each precious item received shall be open to inspection by the County Prosecuting Attorney, Police Department, and the Michigan State Police, at all times during the ordinary business hours of the dealer. As a condition of doing business, a dealer is deemed to have given consent to the inspection prescribed by this subsection. The Record of Transaction forms of a dealer shall not be open to inspection by the general public.
 - Except as otherwise provided in this section, each record of a transaction shall be retained by the dealer for not less than one year after the transaction to which the record pertains.

Section 5.

A precious item received by a dealer shall be retained by the dealer for Seven calendar days after it was received, without any form of alteration other than that required to make an accurate appraisal of its value.

Section 6.

A dealer or an agent or employee of a dealer shall not:

- Knowingly receive or purchase a precious item from any person who is less than 18 years of age or any person known by the dealer or agent or employee of the dealer to have been convicted of theft or receipt of stolen property within the preceding five years, whether the person is acting in his or her own behalf or as the agent of another.
 - Knowingly receive or purchase a precious item from a person unless that person presents a valid driver's license or a valid State of Michigan personal identification card.
- ##### Section 7.
- A dealer or an agent or employee of a dealer who knowingly fails to make an entry of any material matter in his or her records kept as required by Section 4 (1) is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for not more than Ninety days, or a fine of \$500.00, or both.
 - A dealer who knowingly violates Section 3(5), 3(6), 4(1)(e), 4(4), or 4(5) is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for not more than Ninety days, or a fine of \$500.00, or both.
 - A dealer or an agent or employee of a dealer who does any of the following is guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment for not more than Ninety days, or a fine of \$500.00, or both:
 - Totally fails to record a transaction on a record of transaction form as required by Section 4(1).
 - Knowingly falsifies the records kept as required by Section 4.
 - Violates Section 6.

Section 8.

This ordinance shall become operative and effective on the 29th day of June, A.D. 1982.

Made, passed and adopted by the City Commission of the City of Plymouth, Michigan, this 7th day of June A.D. 1982.

Spree boxers entertain

Of the 17 bouts held Wednesday during the Spree Boxing Show at Livonia's Edgar Arena, none was bigger than the battle between super-heavyweights Craig Payne and Claude Tucker.

It was a rematch the pair's bout last March in the National Golden Gloves Tournament in Kansas City, Mo. Payne, a member of the Livonia Boxing Club, won when Tucker was

disqualified for excessive holding.

In the Spree show, Tucker, a 350-pound slugger from Toledo, and 220-pound Payne, ranked third among U.S. amateurs, went the entire three rounds and gave the enthusiastic crowd, estimated at 1,000, something to cheer about.

Payne won a unanimous decision and almost became the first fighter to put the mammoth Tucker on the canvas.

The Livonia boxer, who staged a fury of combinations, staggered

Tucker once but couldn't get the big guy to go down.

Tucker, who surprisingly has quick hands, tired in the later going and tried to bull Payne into the ropes. Payne, however, stepped away and continued to score blows.

The next stop for Payne is a trip July 13-18 to Venezuela as a member of the U.S. Boxing Team. He then moves on July 25-30 for the National Sports Festival in Indianapolis.

LIVONIA'S Rick Lundberg and Robert Buckley of Toledo, a pair of National Golden Glove heavyweights, slugged it out toe-to-toe for three rounds in one of the best bouts of the evening. Buckley was awarded a split decision.

At 156 pounds, 28-year-old Joe Schrank of the Livonia Boxing Club won his first match in four tries on a unanimous decision. In another 156-pound bout, Livonia's Matt Swift was scoring effectively against Tussand Jewell of the Detroit Boxing Alliance in the first round before tripping and spraining his ankle. Swift had to default, and Jewell was awarded the decision.

Livonia's Mike Dardini, who won the Novice Bantam (119-pounds) title in the Detroit-area Golden Gloves finals last February, moved up to the open class and decisioned Alvin Thomas of Detroit Street Services.

Youth prevails on 1982 All-Area girls' kick team

Girls' soccer is a young sport, still experiencing the growing pains all new sports must suffer before taking root and flourishing. No state tournament for girls' soccer exists, and most of the teams are concentrated around the Detroit area.

The state of the game in this area mirrors its young image in Michigan high schools. Seven local players were chosen to the West Suburban Soccer Association (WSSA) first-team. Four are sophomores and three are juniors.

The four Livonia schools, including Churchill, which was rated by the Michigan High School Soccer Coaches Association as the top team in the state, relied heavily on underclassmen to build successful seasons.

CHURCHILL RETURNS nine starters next year. Livonia Stevenson, ranked fourth in the state, loses only two seniors.

Livonia Franklin started seven freshmen during the season and finished with a 10-7 record and a ninth-place rating. Livonia Bentley loses just three starters to graduation from this season's eighth-ranked squad.

Picked to the All-State first team, Zeches was voted Churchill's most valuable player and will serve as a team co-captain next season.

Shelly Stazel, Salem, forward — According to Salem coach Ken Johnson, Stazel is "a very determined player with a good attitude." Her determination paid off for the Rocks, as the sophomore accounted for 17 goals and 10 assists.

Take a pal to see compelling story of space creature

Children, grab your parents. Parents, grab your children. Anyone, grab a friend, lover, stranger off the street and go see "E.T. The Extra-Terrestrial" (PG).

It's an exhilarating experience, and one that deserves to be shared with someone.

Those whose have seen "E.T." already are sharing a special mood and feeling. Steven Spielberg's movie creates an emotional high of good will that, in some strange way, even infects those about to see the movie, who share a happy sort of camaraderie waiting in line.

Spielberg describes "E.T." as his most personal movie, but it also can be seen as a continuation of "Close Encounters of the Third Kind." The premise is, What would happen if one of the beings from outer space accidentally were stranded on earth?

"E.T." begins with the strange, frightened Extra-Terrestrial separated from his spaceship and hunted by a menacing group of men. It is the flip side of the usual scenario in which humans are terrorized by creatures from outer space, as in "Invasion of the Body Snatchers" or "The Thing."

IT IS ONE of Spielberg's great strengths as a creative artist that he is able to bring us different points of view and make them credible. Actually, in "E.T." we get two different points of view: that of the Extra-Terrestrial in which adult humans appear as anonymous and threatening creatures, and that of the 10-year-old Elliott who befriends E.T.

To Elliott, whose father has deserted the family, adults are not menacing as much as they are callous and uncaring. Elliott comes to regard E.T. as a very special and secret friend, not a scientific curiosity to be probed and dissected.

The special relationship between Elliott and E.T. is the heart of the movie. Although the plot is about an alien stranded on earth who wants to return home, the theme explores values of trust, friendship and reverence for life.

The bond of friendship that grows between E.T. and Elliott becomes so strong that they develop a telepathic rapport. Each feels what affects the other. In one of the movie's most inventive scenes, Elliott disrupts an entire class at school when E.T., left alone at home, samples some beer with wild results.

Both Melissa Mathison, who wrote the script, and Spielberg, who conceived the original idea and directed, have remarkable insight into children and animals. They do a magnificent job of capturing the nervous beginnings of introduction, as Elliott and E.T. become acquainted through a series of hesitant advances and skittish retreats.

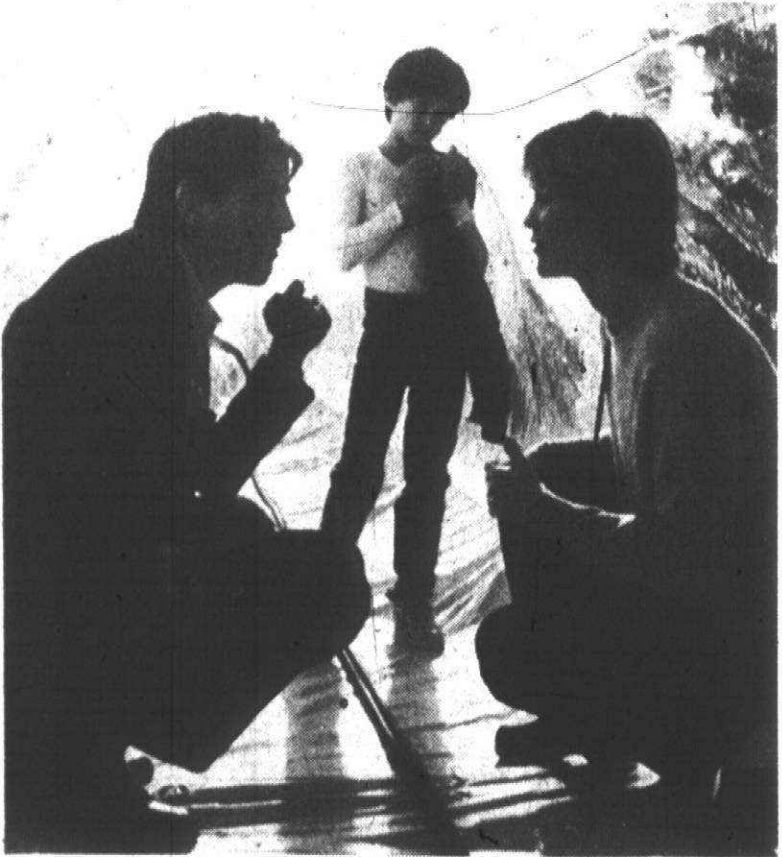
THE PATTERN IS similar to that shown in "The Black Stallion," also scripted by Mathison, in which the boy befriends the horse. In "The Black Stallion," the boy entices the horse with seaweed. In "E.T." he does it with M&Ms.

To realize the potential of this movie, Spielberg has put together a splendid cast, none of whom are well known, but all of whom deliver perfectly tuned performances. Among them are Dee Wallace as Elliott's mother, Drew Barrymore as his little sister and Robert McNaughton as his older brother.

Henry Thomas, who appeared as one of Sissy Spacek's children in "Raggedy Man," is outstanding as Elliott. He delivers an emotional punch near the end of the movie that would put to shame the efforts of many adult actors.

Finally, Carlo Rambaldi must be singled out for creating E.T. His range of expression and movement is so great, and he appears so real, that you expect to find him listed in the credits like any other actor.

The result is that the Extra-Terrestrial is the kind of lovable creature anyone would like to take home. After all, you never grow too old to want a special friend. Spielberg knows that and has captured that longing in a movie bound to have timeless and universal appeal.

A lively show, with plenty of good songs and choreography, is "The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas," starring Edie Adams, at the Birmingham Theatre.

This production has lots of energy and singing voices that are pleasing to the ear. The audience on opening night loved "The Aggie Song," the musical number sung and danced by the foot-stompin' Aggies football team.

The team goes from football helmets and jerseys to Texas hats and checked shirts as they prepare for a night at the "Chicken Ranch" whorehouse to celebrate their victory. At curtain time, the struttin' Aggies in their cowboy boots got the biggest applause.

Edie Adams is a good-natured Miss Mona, slightly brassy and bold, whose manner is more gentle than her appearance would indicate. She looks the epitome of a tough madam, with her overblown locks of flaming red hair and a first-act entrance costume of royal blue and marabou.

ART LUND plays the aging but relentlessly determined Sheriff Ed Earl Dodd, who runs his town like a one-man band. Lund is a big guy with a big voice, and he comes on surprisingly strong in this role that could easily become a comic second-banana for the rest of the proceedings.

Lund manages to extract a lot of sympathy, as well as humor, for his character, and almost overpowers the production.

The real-life "best little whorehouse" had a history of 150 years in Texas until it was closed down in the 1970s by do-gooders. In the musical, Stephen

Bray is Melvin P. Thorpe, the "Watchdog" of "The Watchdog News," who leads the vigilante efforts to get Mona and the Girls out.

Bray neatly handles the role of The Watchdog, perfectly attuned to his TV audience, with a fantastic headful of hair and shining teeth. The stage production clearly takes a stand for the Chicken Ranch, which got its name because farmboys who couldn't pay in cash for services rendered paid in chickens.

AS PRESENTED here, it's all good, clean fun. In fact, one of the songs in the show reminds everybody that ain't nothing dirty goin' on. Mona and the Girls sing, "It's just a lil ole bitty pissant country place," making sex for money sound almost wholesome.

Part of the show's appeal is its mix of daring and endearing. Dora Pearson is Angel, and Rebecca Ann Seay is Shy, two girls who arrive at the Chicken Ranch, off the same bus, to ask Miss Mona for jobs. Pearson is appropriately nifty but good-hearted underneath and a dedicated absentee mother to boot. Seay makes her little farm girl winsome as she learns the tricks of the trade.

Hypocrisy is spoofed in such numbers as "Texas Has a Whorehouse in It," sung by the Melvin Thorpe gang; the "Angelette March," danced by tapping feet of the shiny-cheeked Imogene Charlene and the Angelettes; and "The Sideshow," sung and danced by the Governor of Texas (Philip Oesterman).

The Governor neatly sidesteps demands to close down the Chicken Ranch, until he finds it politically expedient to do so.

With all this pay-sex, free love isn't left out either. Edwina Lewis is featured in the cast as Jewel, Miss Mona's personal maid, who on her day off gives away what the other Girls sell.

In "Twenty-Four Hours of Lovin'," Lewis belts out with abandon her philosophy of love. She's got a voice that can go from whisper to shout with gospel-like enthusiasm.

"THE BEST Little Whorehouse" is so carefully put together that each musical number has a life of its own, yet adds progressively to the whole. From the opening "20 Fans," where the Girls sing about their jobs, to the near-closing "Hard Candy Christmas," where they foresee their bleak futures, the songs have vivid color.

There are other poignant numbers. "Doatsey Mae," sung by Amy Miller, the lunch-counter waitress, shows how a good girl thinks when she'd like to be a little bit bad. Doatsey Mae has dreams, some of them spicy, but she's too respectable to fulfill any of them.

Miss Mona has a nice song, "Girl You're a Woman," which she sings to the newly arrived Shy, reminding her of life's reality. In "Bus from Amarillo" Mona sings to herself, recalling her own efforts to escape from one life into another. She never had the guts to take the bus to nowhere.

Keeping the show moving brightly onstage throughout is a country band, led by Art Yelton, who sings the saga of the Chicken Ranch. John Newton contributes to the sprightly activity in dual roles as the Senator, who brings the football team to the Chicken Ranch, and the town's part-time Mayor, who also sells cars.

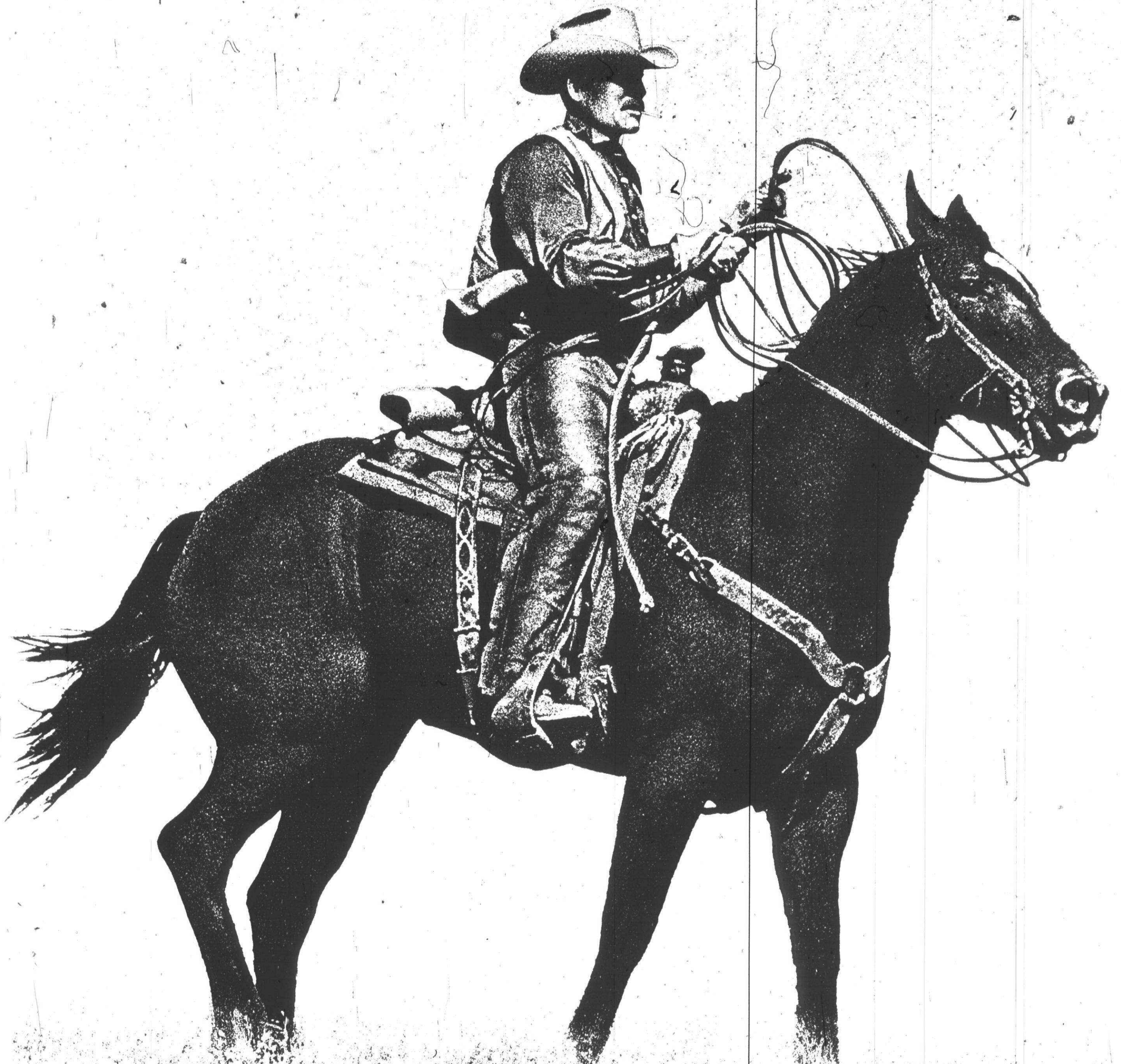

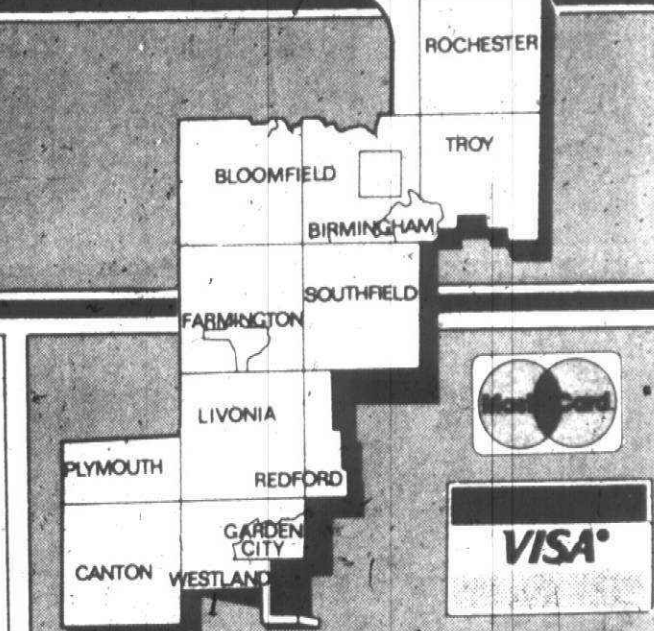

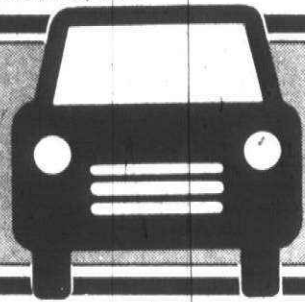
