FALL REGISTRATION for the Canton Crickets preschool program for 3- and 4-year-old children begins at 8:30 a.m. Aug. 17 at the Canton recreation offices on the basement floor of Township Hall at Canton Center south of Cherry Hill.

Ed Kleinsmith, accident victim, died Saturday

Elementary School principal Ed Kleinsmith, 46, who was struck by a car while jogging along Joy near McClumpha Road early July 22, died Saturday afternoon in Oakwood hospital, Dearborn.

Kleinsmith, principal of Fiegall Elementary School since 1976, was struck by a car which apparently crossed over the center line of traffic. He had been hospitalized in Oakwood since the accident.

Police are expected to make a decision today on whether to seek prosecution of the driver, a 17-year-old Plymouth Township girl.

Friends said Kleinsmith jogged every morning along Joy near his Plymouth Township home. Kleinsmith had been with the Plymouth Canton school system since 1963 as a teacher, assistant principal and principal.

A memorial service is scheduled for 7 p.m. tonight at Schrader Funeral Home in Plymouth. The family asked that instead of flowers, donations be made to a memorial fund.

Paving tax, partisan races are on ballot

Canton voters in tomorrow's primary election will vote on a one-mill tax levy to improve and pave roads in the township, as well as vote for candidates for elective offices.

The tax issue calls for residents to decide whether property taxes should be boosted by one mill (\$1 for every \$1,000 of assessed valuation) for five years to pave about 6½ miles of dirt roads in the township.

In the partisan races, voters may select only one party — Democratic, Republican or the Anderson Coalition — and then vote for candidates in that party, election officials say.

Voters may vote for candidates for governor, Wayne County executive, state and national legislative seats and county commissioners. Primary winners will compete in the general election next November.

Ticket-splitting will void the entire ballot, according to Robert Ficano, Wayne County deputy clerk, and David Peterson, of the Secretary of State's elections division.

The polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Only about 400 Canton voters

have requested absentee ballots, leading Clerk John Flodin to predict a very light turnout.

"Mr. Flodin didn't think we would even gain the 25 percent (of eligible voters) level," said Doris Kelley, a secretary in the clerk's office. Canton has 26,950 registered voters.

DUE TO reapportionment, Canton Township has been divided into two House of Representatives districts.

The 36th Michigan House District also includes Plymouth and Northville. The 37th also includes Wayne, Romulus, Belleville, Sumpter and Van Buren townships.

The 6th District of the state Senate includes Plymouth, Northville and Canton Townships and Plymouth, Northville, Livonia and part of Redford.

The 15th Congressional District includes Canton, Westland, Wayne, Garden City, Taylor, Romulus and southern Livonia.

All of Canton is included in the 11th District for the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

Schools want to buy teaching computers

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education has been asked to approve the purchase of 20 mini-computers for the instructional program at the Centennial Educational Park.

The administration is recommending acceptance of a bid of \$37,335 from Computer Horizons of Livonia to acquire 20 Apple II micro computers, disc drives and 20 Zenith monitors plus nine Apple printers and eight Apple disc drives.

The purchase, if approved, will allow the CEP to expand the Plymouth Canton High computer lab and the curriculum to allow for a class in ad-

vanced computers.

Currently only a class in beginning computer science is being offered. Enrollment is limited to seniors — about 35 in a classroom.

The meeting will begin at 7:30 tonight upstairs of the administration offices at 454 S. Harvey.

Rates hiked for cable TV viewers

Many Omnicom viewers in Plymouth and Plymouth Township are paying more for cable television services because of an Aug. 1 rate increase.

Rates were raised in August from \$6.95 to \$7.95 per month per service. The regular service rate is \$7.95. Omnicom officials say the \$6.95 figure represented a discount rate that has expired.

The rate hike has caused frustration and confusion among some residents who believed that \$6.95 figure would

stay constant, or remain for two years after receiving individual service.

"There has been some confusion, and we don't understand why," said Peter Newell, Senior Vice President of the Northern Division for Capital Cities Cable, the company which owns Omnicom.

The \$6.95 rate was offered as a discount price during the first year of cable construction for persons who subscribed during that time, Newell explained.

In fact, some cable viewers in Canton Township still have \$6.95 rates because of later construction. Canton viewers should expect a future rate in-

crease, similar to Plymouth's, but Newell said he didn't know when that change would come.

CABLE CONSTRUCTION in Plymouth and Plymouth Township was almost totally completed in February 1981, Newell said.

However, Omnicom agreed to keep the \$6.95 rate two years after individual subscribers began receiving cable TV viewing. For most Plymouth residents, initial viewing began in August 1980, Newell said.

Plymouth Township Supervisor Maurice Breen believes some Plymouth Township residents are receiving their

rate increase prematurely. Omnicom is raising rates two years from the time the franchise package was completed, rather than actual hook-up time, he added.

"The township administration's understanding was that it was two years from the time of hook-up, as long as you took hook-up when it was first offered to you," Breen said.

"We are in the process of preparing a letter outlining our position. By contract, they will have 60 days to remedy the situation."

A Plymouth Township attorney is preparing the letter, Breen said. The letter is expected to object to the rate

increase for homes not having cable hook-up for two years. It also will mention other areas of service the township believes Omnicom has failed to provide, including local programming, Breen said.

Omnicom plans to send out a mailer to explain the various rate change to subscribers, Newell said.

"If anyone is under any misunderstanding, we want them to call us at 459-7300 to make some kind of adjustment," Newell said.

A spokesperson at that number said that rate concerns are being handled "individually, to be sure everyone in the system is treated fairly."

Canton woman assaulted

Canton police are warning women to avoid walking alone in deserted areas or at night in the township.

A 26-year-old Canton woman was jumped by a man while walking home from work early last Tuesday. He threatened her with rape and stabbing, then ran away after slapping her.

According to police, at least three similar incidents have been reported in the nearby Ypsilanti-Ann Arbor area recently.

"Evidently, he cruises to find this sort of thing (women alone)," explained Canton police Lt. Larry Stewart. "We

want people to know it's taking place, and might happen again. Knowledge offers some minimal protection."

THE CANTON attack occurred as the woman walked along Haggerty Road south of Ford Road shortly after midnight Tuesday, said police. She was

returning from a job at a Canton party store.

"He came up from behind, and asked for a cigarette," explained Cpl. Rob Cripe, who is handling the case. "He tackled her, knocking her down into the woods."

The assailant threatened to rape and stab the woman to death. He hit her in the face with his fist and hands, said Cripe.

After making the cryptic comment, "Oh, you're the wrong one," the assailant ran west on Ford Road.

The suspect is described as a light-complexioned black man about 40 years old, with a mustache and natural-style afro hairdo. He is about 5-feet-9, and weighs 150 pounds.

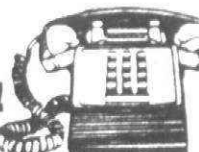

CITY OF PLYMOUTH MICHIGAN
ORDINANCE NO. 82-10
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 8.28 OF CHAPTER 126 OF TITLE X OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH
THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:
Section 1. This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the Handicapped Parking Ordinance, and shall amend Section 8.28 of Chapter 126 as follows:
Section 2. The City of Plymouth, Wayne County, Michigan, by and through its City Commission enacts this ordinance for the purpose of providing handicapped parking areas for the handicapped (handicappers) in order to improve the quality of their lives; to comply with Public Act 88 of 1978, being Michigan Compiled Laws 257.942a, which mandates that each municipality provide by ordinance certain handicapped parking facilities, and to provide penalties for the violation of its provisions.
Section 3. Definitions
A. "Shopping Center" shall mean a minimum area of three (3) acres of land on which there is located one or more stores or business establishments, and where there is provided a parking area.
B. "Handicapper" is a person who, for the purposes of this act, has a physical characteristic categorized as a handicap, which limits ambulation, or necessitates the use of a wheelchair for mobility, or a person who is blind.
C. "Handicapped Parking Space" shall mean a parking space twelve (12) feet wide marked off in blue or yellow paint. A sign located approximately six (6) feet above grade inscribed with the international wheelchair symbol or a reasonable facsimile thereof shall identify the handicapped space.
Section 4. General Requirements
A. There shall be handicapped parking facilities as specified in this ordinance in all parking areas of shopping centers.
Section 5. Handicapped Parking Space Required
Each shopping center shall provide handicapped parking spaces in numbers to conform with the following table:

Section 6. Handicapped Parking Spaces Provided in On-Street Parking
It is the intention of the City of Plymouth to provide handicapped parking spaces on streets where legal parking is permitted by the City Traffic Engineer as follows:
1. At the request of a Handicapper's Certificate issued by the Secretary of State, on a showing of a Handicapper, in front of or adjacent to his or her residence, for the use of a Handicapper, or unless the person is parking the vehicle for the benefit of a Handicapper. A Certificate of Identification issued to a Handicapper shall be displayed on the vehicle.
Section 7.
A person shall not park a vehicle, except in compliance with the directions of a police officer in a parking space clearly identified by an official sign as being reserved for the use by handicappers which is on public property available for public use, unless the person is a handicapper or unless the person is parking the vehicle for the benefit of a handicapper. A Certificate of Identification issued to a handicapper shall be displayed on the vehicle.
Section 8.
A person who parks a vehicle in violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25.00, nor more than \$100.00, and/or imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. An additional penalty in the form of a late charge set at \$5.00 will be imposed for fines not paid on or before the 14th day after the date of the violation.
Section 9.
This ordinance shall become operative and effective on the 10th day of August, 1982.
Made, passed and adopted by the City Commission of the City of Plymouth, Michigan, this 19th day of July, 1982.

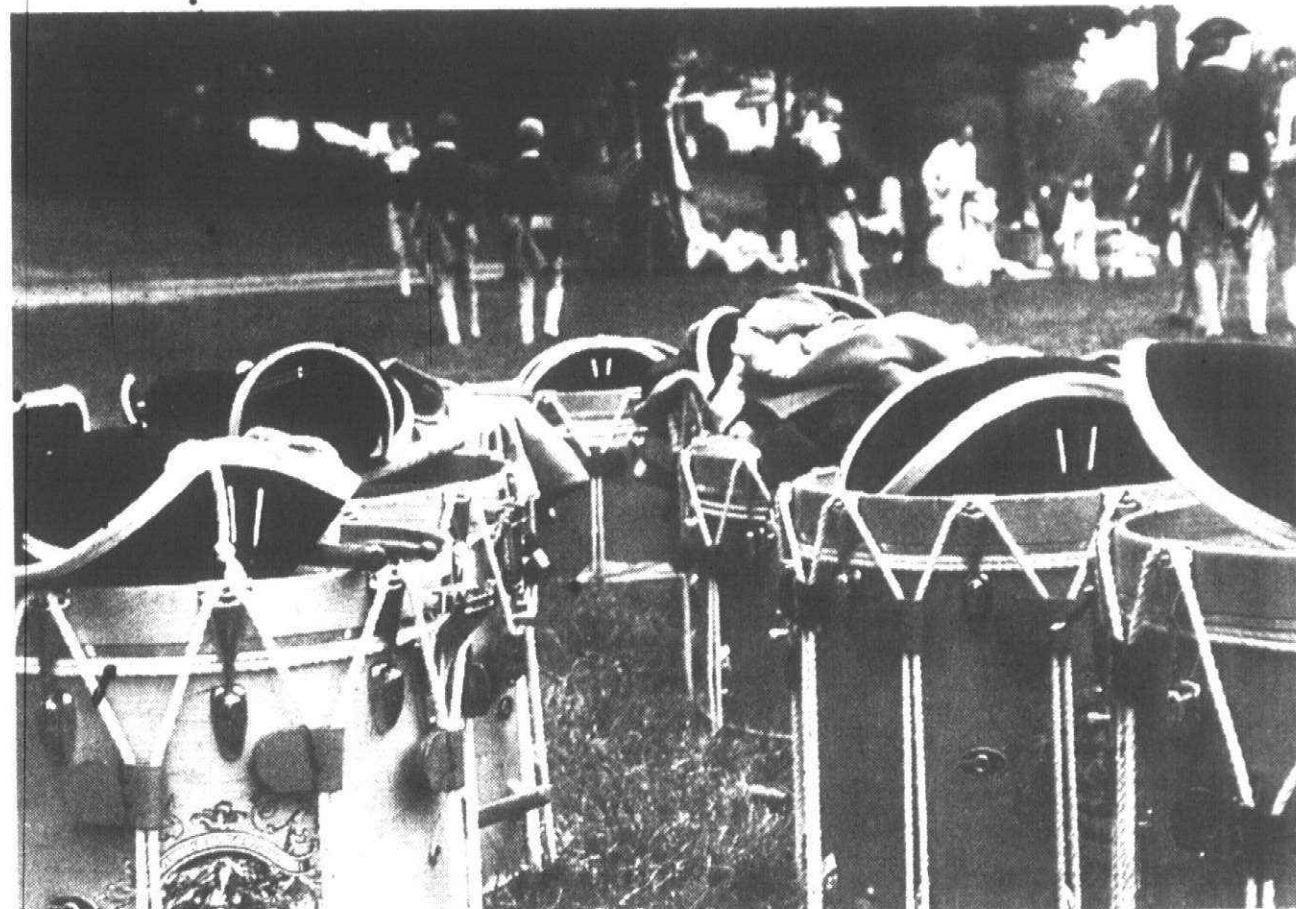

Another busy season for fife & drummers

"It's a lot of fun"
"I like always taking first place."
"It's work, but it's worth it."

These are typical comments from members of the Plymouth Fife and Drum Corps — a group of 47 girls and boys 12 to 18 years old who play the fifes and drums in parades, festivals,

and musters throughout Michigan and the eastern states.

This year's members come from Plymouth, Canton, Livonia, Northville, Westland and Sterling Hts.

The groups 18th-century uniforms (an authentic replica of George Washington's Life Guard) excellent music and precision marching can sometimes produce a deceiving picture — there's a great deal of hard work and dedication involved in presenting such a polished performance.

Marie Colling, 17, of Northville, for example, encourages people to join the Corps — if they will dedicate themselves. Practices are every Monday evening with special practices scheduled throughout the season. Performances will total almost 60 this year.

Colling joined the corps last year as a fife player and is the only female bass drummer this season.

As a first year fife, Kevin Murray, 15, of Northville, intends to stay in the corps until he's 18 years old and then, perhaps, pursue a musical career.

"It's real exciting and really fun," he says. "You meet a lot of new people."

Murray was introduced to the organization when Leonard Goren, corps director, came to his school to recruit.

Leading the way in any parade is the Plymouth Corps color guard. Gayle Davenport, a color guard member, is one of the flusket carriers. Davenport lives in Plymouth and, at 12 years old, is one of the youngest members.

PARENTS ARE a vital element in the organization. Cheryl Toles of Canton, whose daughter, Mary, 14, is a fife, describes parents as the backbone of the organization. Fundraising activities, transportation, financial support, and encouragement are only a few of the many contributions mothers and fathers make.

With an 8-year-old and a 4-year-old already excited about the corps, Toles says she could be in the corps for a long time.

Northville resident Colin Martin, president of the corps' board of directors, and wife Lynn describe the role of parents as "hectic, but fun." Their sons Scott, 16, and Kevin, 13, are a drummer, and a color guard, respectively.

The efforts of both the Corps members and their parents have produced impressive results. This year the corps participated in three of the largest parades in Michigan: Barvaian Festival in Frankenmuth, Independence Day in Wyandotte, and the Blue Water Festival in Port Huron. Goren estimates the corps will perform for more than two million people this year.

During the recent tour to the Deep River, Conn., the musicians won the highest award (competing against 68 units) — a sterling silver Victor D. Malmgren Perpetual Challenge Bowl for best crowd response.

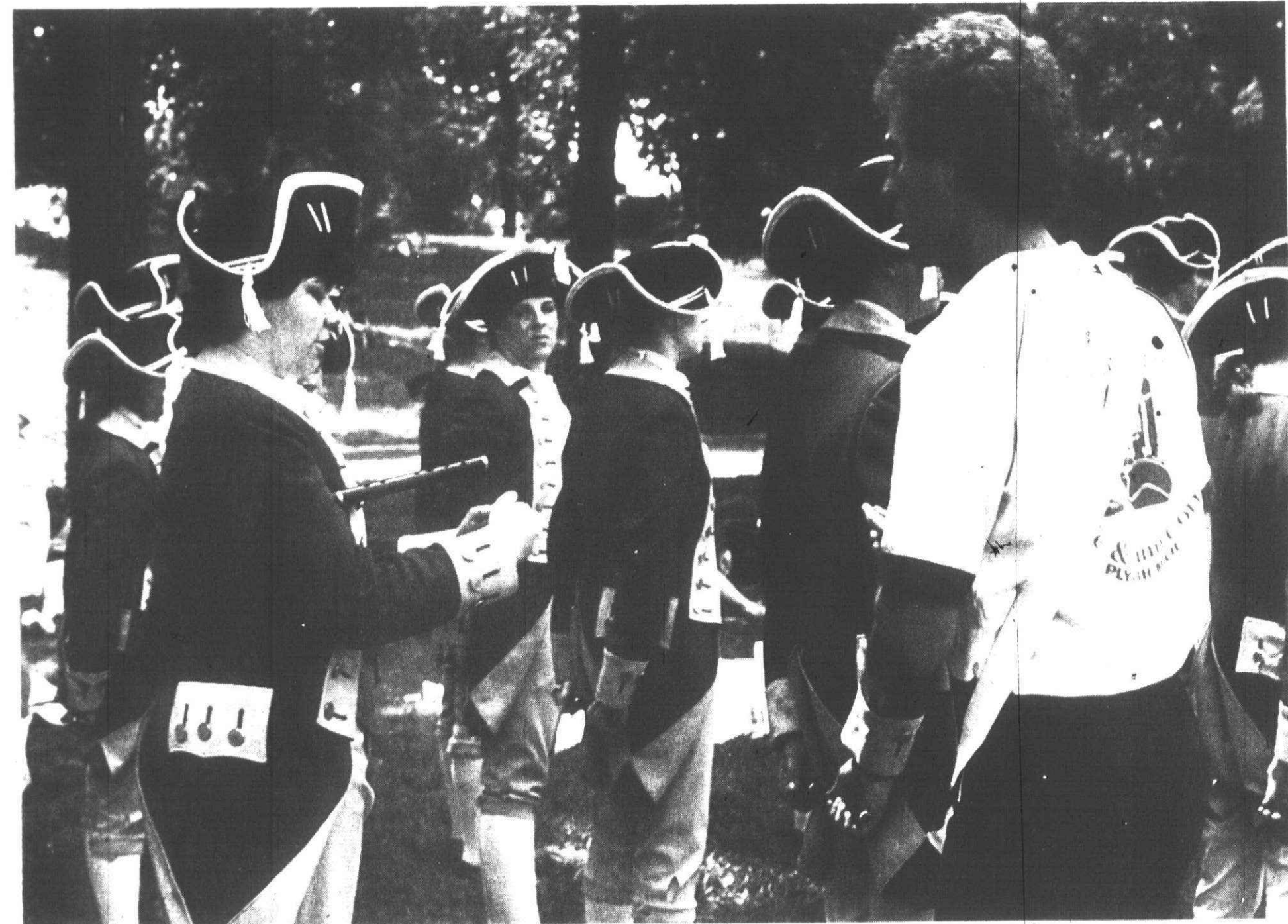
At the fireman's parade in Unionville, Conn., they won best overall musical unit competing against 100 different groups.

In fife and drum competition at Cromwell, Conn., the group won first-place out-of-state awards for best music, color guard, and appearance.

This year, the corps has received the following first place awards: best musical unit, Trenton Memorial Day Parade; best marching unit, Farmington Memorial Day parade; best musical unit, the Sugar Festival, Sebawaing; best marching band, Northville 4th of July parade; best major, Wyandotte Independence Day parade.

The group also was the highest scoring musical unit overall at the Blue Water Festival in Port Huron.

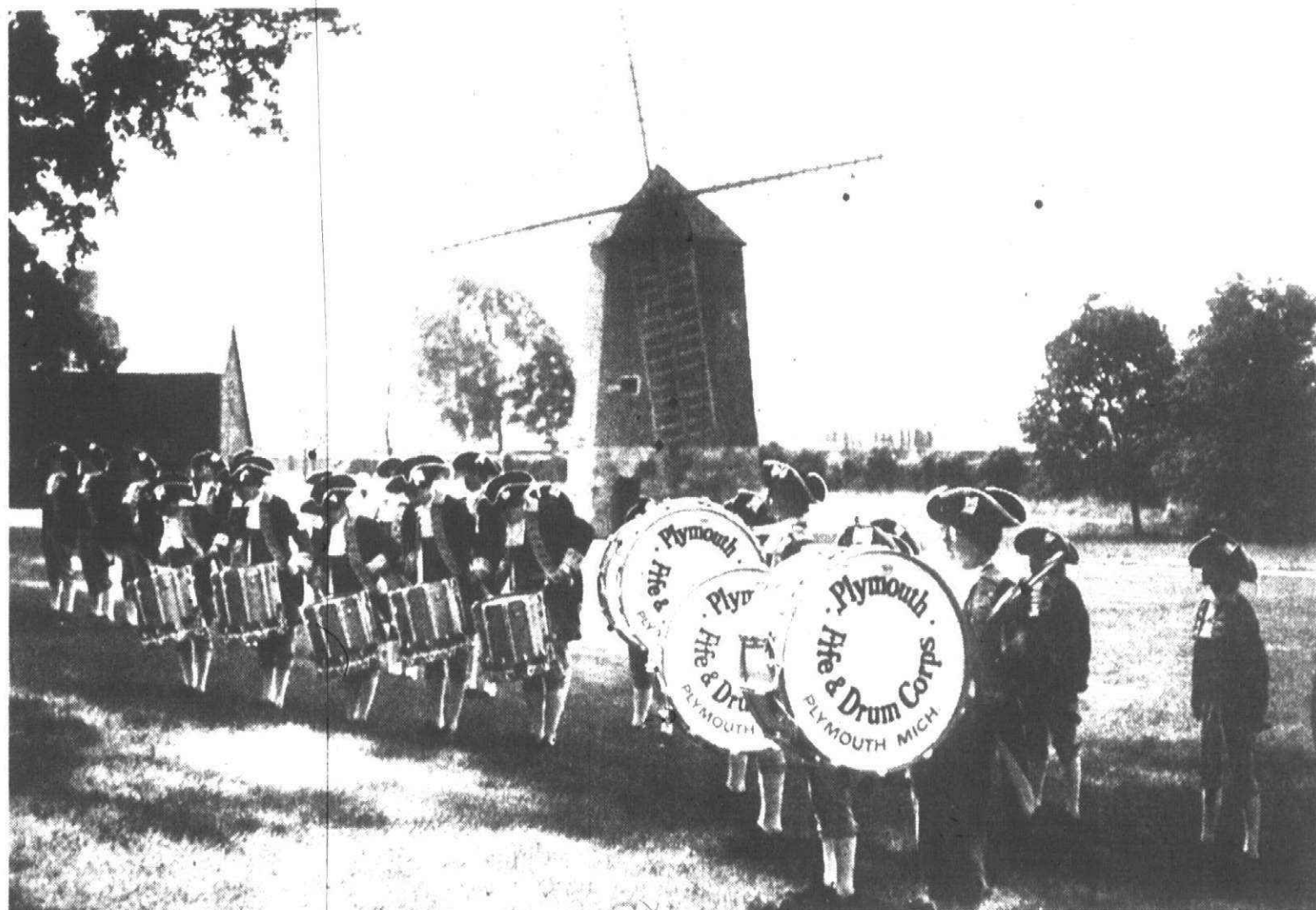

the CEP, and computer instructor Ron Carlson both recommend expansion of the lab at Canton High, for the following reasons:

- Security and span of control would be greater with one lab.
- A single lab would facilitate team teaching.

Brown and Buikema point out that the CEP concept doesn't necessarily

support the arguments made for a lab at each high school.

"There are many programs located only in one building, such as radio, TV production, physics, photography, automotive classes, and construction technology. In all, about 40 classes are offered in just one building."

The Apple II computers are relatively portable, the principals added, and can be easily relocated as needed in the future.

Layoffs loom for members of three unions in the Wayne-Westland School District after they refused to accept contract concessions sought by the school board.

The employee groups have rejected a proposal calling for five days off without pay, said William Taylor, assistant superintendent of employee relations in the district.

The unions that rejected the proposal were para-professionals (teachers aids), cafeteria workers, bus drivers and custodians; and skilled maintenance workers.

Those unions have a combined membership of 507.

The school board in a closed meeting Monday authorized administrators to begin preparing layoff lists, Taylor said, but he wouldn't speculate on when the lists would be ready or how many employees will be affected.

"As soon as we can get recommendations back from various divisions, we'll review them with the superintendent, and call them (union leaders) back in to review the scope and specific posi-

tions," Taylor said.

"We'll listen to what they have to say," he added.

Different contracts stipulate employee notice for laying off employees. The contracts also differ on seniority and bumping rights.

The administration said earlier that the concessions or layoffs are needed to save \$1.2 million in the current operating budget.

TWO EMPLOYEE groups — principals and assistant principals (46 members) and central office administrators (34) — have agreed to the five days off without pay, Taylor said.

A response was expected from leadership of the 149-member secretaries union sometime yesterday, Taylor said, but wasn't available at press time.

Taylor will present the proposal to the 10 executive secretaries employed by the district Monday, he said.

The teachers union has agreed to forego a 2-percent pay increase scheduled to take effect Sept. 1 until no later than Oct. 22, Taylor said. The teachers union is the largest bargaining group in the district, with 1,000 members.

All information on state aid and revenues generated by local taxes will be available by Oct. 22, Taylor said.

"If (teachers) concessions do not come in October, it's very clear we will treat all employee groups the same, and layoffs will come as soon as possible," he said.

Class periods could be cut from 55 to 45 minutes at the secondary level and about 70 teachers let go when the second semester begins in early February, Taylor said.

THERE'S NO certainty layoffs can be avoided even with concessions, Taylor said.

"What we've said is if you don't

agree to concessions, we guarantee you there will be layoffs," Taylor said.

"If you agree, it's entirely possible there won't be layoffs, but we cannot give you that absolute guarantee because we don't have dollar figures in front of us."

There's still time for the unions that rejected the concessions to reconsider and perhaps avoid layoffs, Taylor believes.

"I would look upon it very favorably," he said, adding he's sure the board would, too.

A spokesman for the custodians, cafeteria workers and bus drivers cited two reasons the union's membership rejected the concessions.

"We would just as soon go to the table and talk concessions rather than have them dictate to us," she said. "Our senior people just didn't want to give it up. They just don't want to lose the time."

Eileen Mallon, president of the para-professionals unit, was out of town on vacation and unavailable for comment.

John Mitchell, chapter chairman of the maintenance workers, and William Reece, president of the teachers union, couldn't be reached for comment.

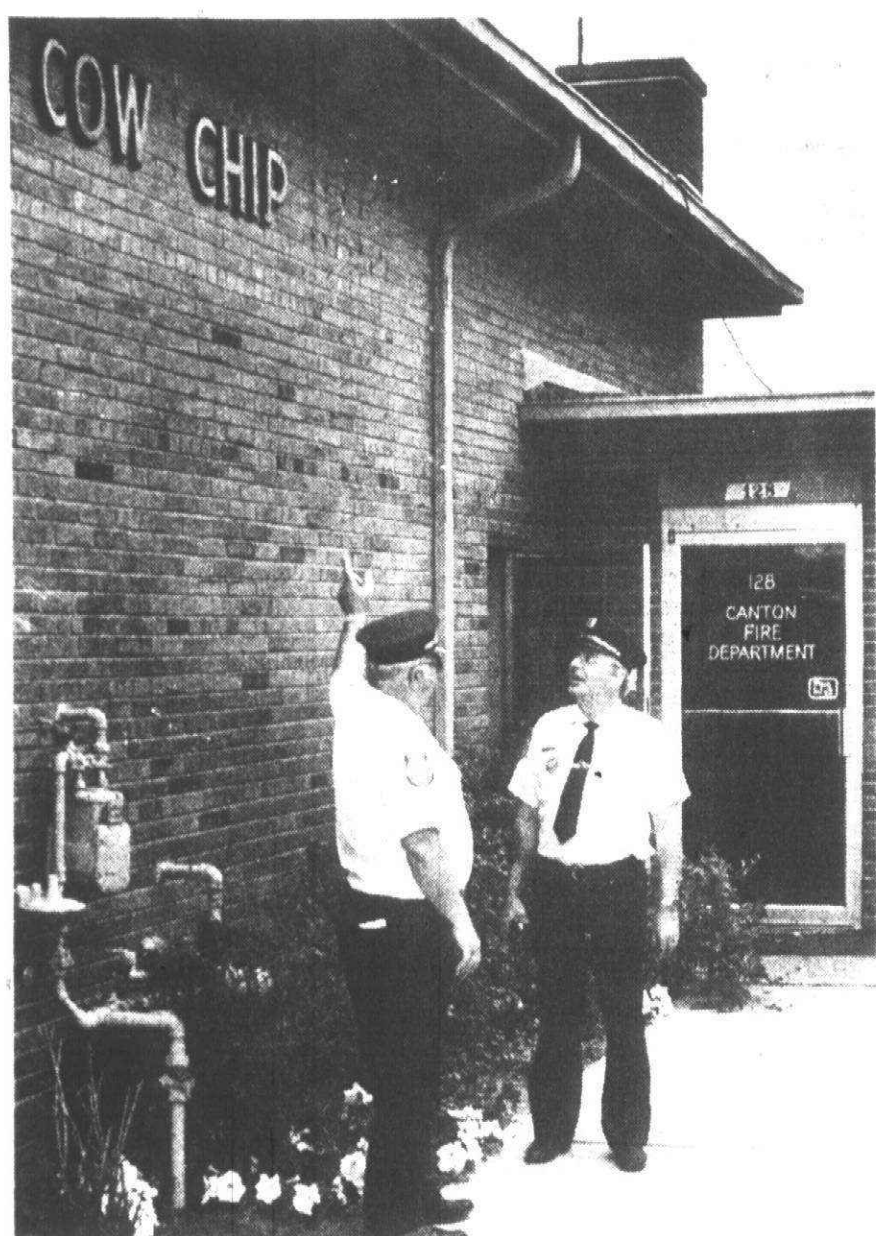

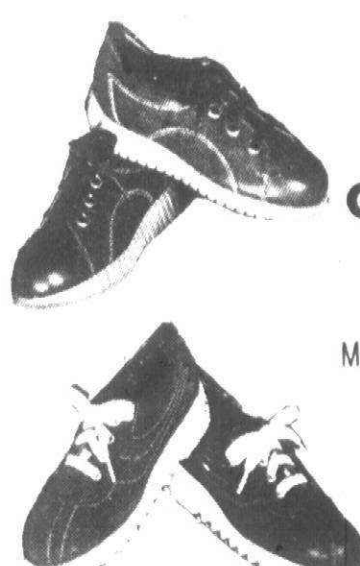

How the community college got its name

(Part XIV)

Edward V. McNally, English instructor and counselor at Delta College, joined Schoolcraft College as assistant dean of students on Sept. 1, 1963.

Two years later, McNally, who had his master's degree from the University of Minnesota, became dean of student affairs at Schoolcraft when Lois Waterman retired.

McNally was named vice president of student affairs in 1968. When the college's second president (Dr. C. Nelson Grote) left for Spokane in mid-1981, McNally served as interim president of Schoolcraft for about six months.

It was then (late last summer) that the college's third president, (Dr. Richard W. McDowell) arrived.

McNally, who officially retired Dec. 31, 1981, says one of the first jobs Waterman gave him when he joined her at the old Newburgh School was to select the college colors.

He went from store to store, picking up color samples, and feeling a little bit foolish "in a task I was not cut out for." The college colors became blue and gold.

AMONG HIS OTHER duties, McNally consulted with Veterans' Adminis-

tration authorities to make sure the college programs were acceptable for veterans' benefits.

He also remembers setting up a Student Senate Workshop in June 1964, several months before the college opened (an example of the foresight characterizing much of the work done by the small cadre of administrators before the first student body arrived).

Made up of 12 high school students who intended to enter the college, this provisional student senate laid plans for a constitution which they submitted to the student body in October.

The students who participated in the workshop were selected on the basis of citizenship, character and leadership in their respective high schools.

They included Barbara Bender and Thomas Blunk from Plymouth High School; James Driscoll and Sally Kandal from Livonia Bentley; Pamela

Beers and Michael Steffes from Clarenceville High; David Linderman and Nancy Rochette from Livonia Franklin; Fred Bailey and Bonnie Boatman from Garden City High; and Ann Moase and William Wilson from Northville High.

"NORTHWEST WAYNE County Community College," the jaw-breaker with which the board first saddled the institution, soon began to lose its charm. The trustees decided to change it.

In November 1962, they announced a "name-the-college" contest, offering as the prize a two-year, full-tuition scholarship to be used by any person the winner designated.

When the contest ended on Dec. 15, "Eleanor Roosevelt College" was among the many names submitted. Others made use of the names of John F. Kennedy, Robert Frost, Kismet, Excelsior, Norwayne, Greenglade, Skyline, Rouge Valley, John Pierce (Michigan's first superintendent of public instruction), and Father Gabriel Richard (who actively promoted education in Michigan in the early 1800s).

None of these appealed to the board. Rejecting them all, the board proceeded to name the college after Henry Rowe Schoolcraft.

The motion to adopt the name was made by board member Jane Moehle. Moehle and Waterman had spent some time at the Burton historical section of the main Detroit Library looking up possible names for the college.

The librarian at Burton had called their attention to Schoolcraft and his achievements in Michigan.

AS A SCHOLAR, author, Indian agent and explorer, Henry Rowe Schoolcraft was influential in the early development of the state.

In 1822, he was Indian agent at Sault Ste. Marie for the tribes of Lake Supe-

rior. In 1828, he helped organize the Historical Society of Michigan. From 1837 to 1841, he was a member of the first Board of Regents of the University of Michigan.

Among other writers, James Russell Lowell and Henry Wadsworth Longfellow were inspired by the books about Indians written by Schoolcraft. Longfellow gained his material for the poem "Hiawatha" from Schoolcraft.

The contest to name the college prompted Pat Butler, director of the college's library, to write a tongue-in-check gem about the process.

Entitled "How to Name a College Sort Of," it appeared in the Junior College Journal in February 1968. One reason the older name was not popular,

wrote Butler, was that "the girl at the switchboard found it difficult to repeat 'Northwest Wayne County Community College' brightly at three minute intervals without losing her cool by coffee break time."

The name also was cumbersome when used in newspaper headlines. Butler posited an abbreviation like "No.We.Wa.Co.Co.Co." but predicted that it would flop because "when read aloud, it tended to remind readers of the sound track of an old Tarzan film."

The final blow to the old name, said Butler, came when a sports-minded trustee spent a whole week, without success, trying to work up a shoutable cheer around "Northwest Wayne County Community College."

Among the names submitted in the contest, Butler said he could not work much enthusiasm for "Plyonia College," although he concluded that it was better than "Livmouth College." He also conceded that his own favorite, "Taxpayer's Tech," never had a chance.

At one point, Butler wrote, the trustees were going to call it "Henry Rowe Schoolcraft Community College." But one trustee balked.

"Hell's bells," he exclaimed, "that name is longer than the first one. Thirty-seven letters in it, only thirty-six in the one we got now." Remarked Butler: "He was not an unkind trustee, but he had a mathematical mind."

Political plans go astray

MANY YEARS ago, a sage remarked that the best-laid plans of mice and men often go astray.

There is no time of the year when the truth of this old statement is borne out more than at election time. And no one knows this better than The Stroller.

It was the reason he cast aside thoughts of a political career and stuck to journalism, with a bit of charity work on the side.

It started when the Holland Dutch in the Michigan Legislature gathered enough strength to force horse racing off state-owned property. Looking for a place to carry on, the followers of the horses left the State Fair Grounds in Detroit and took options on two farms in Livonia.

This was a big move for the folks who had been cultivating the 17 farms in Livonia Township. When The Stroller pointed out there was \$500,000 at stake from betting and suggested the township be incorporated into a home-rule city, he was asked to serve on a committee.

THAT WAS the start. After the folks voted for incorporation, The Stroller was named to the charter commission and later to the vice presidency of the City Council.

After six years at the council table, he thought the time had come to move up to the top — the mayor's chair.

A program was well planned. One feature was to give detailed speeches outlining the future of this farmland. To help with the spoken word, he had an easel showing each section of the area and what he planned to make of it.

Veteran politicians — including Detroit's late Mayor Albert Cobo, for whom the convention hall in Detroit is named — claimed it was the best planned program for the evolution of a new city.

Everywhere the speech was delivered with the ease, it was applauded. There were all sorts of plans for the future, and The Stroller was looked upon as the man to lead the transformation — at least it looked that way. From all appearances, he was the favorite come election day.

THE DAY broke in splendor. The weather was fine, and it was ideal for a huge turnout. From polling place to polling place he went and was greeted royally at each stop.

Several union officials told him he was a cinch to win, and that he should go home to rest for the real celebration. The world looked rosy — politically. Then they asked for a meeting.

But when the votes were counted, The Stroller, with his election plans and great plans for the evolution of the city, finished absolutely last in a four-man field. There was no reason to ask for a recount.

The best laid plans had gone astray, and The Stroller left the political scene for all time.

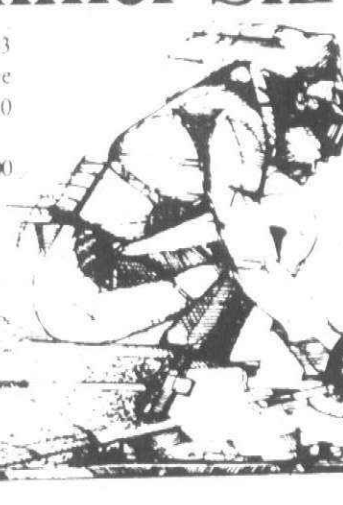

6 escape serious injury in crash

Six people were injured in a chain reaction car accident last week at Joy and Hix roads.

A telephone pole was broken and two cars caught fire during the incident, which occurred at 7:40 p.m. Wednesday. The "jaws of life," a tool for cutting through metal to help get passengers out of vehicles, was used to free one of the victims trapped in his car.

Donald Ninni, 66, of Canton was driving eastbound on Joy Road about 200 feet from Hix when he was hit from behind by John Navarro, 30, also from Canton, said Westland Officer Donald Haigh.

The gas tank on Ninni's car, a 1974 Chrysler, ruptured on impact and both cars burst into flames, Haigh said.

The force of the rear-end collision propelled Ninni's car through a red light at the Joy-Hix intersection and into a car occupied by four people going northbound on Hix, Haigh said.

Navarro, meanwhile, continued eastbound on Joy, Haigh said, veered over the shoulder and struck a telephone pole, shearing it in half.

He was rushed to Wayne County General Hospital where he was treated for a concussion, Haigh said.

Ninni was taken to St. Mary's Hospi-

tal Livonia by Livonia fire rescue and held for observation.

The four passengers in the car hit by Ninni — Rhonda Hazlett, 20, Randall Hazlett, 3 months, and Andrea Hazlett, 18, all of Plymouth; and Amos Zion, 21, of Northville — were also taken to St.

Mary Hospital.

The infant was later transferred to University Hospital in Ann Arbor and Westland fire rescue workers used special tools to cut open the car and then pull out Navarro.

ON HIDING PARTIAL CLASPS

The basic design of the removable partial is a framework of metal with metal clasps that grip the supporting teeth and hold the appliance in the mouth. There is generally acrylic over the ridge areas (the area of missing teeth) to support the replacement teeth.

Most of the esthetic problems with a removable partial have to do with the clasps or hooks that hold it in place. Patients feel that the illusion of naturalness is defeated by the hooks that immediately indicate "removable denture."

The simplest way of overcoming this is to alter the design of the partial. Retention and stability may still be obtained with smaller, thinner clasps. Clasps can be further hidden by placing them as far back on the tooth as possible. This is a very delicate procedure, however, because if the clasp is reduced too much, it loses its function. A partial that doesn't stay in the mouth is useless, no matter how esthetic it is. However, dentistry has come a long way in combining function with pleasing appearance in the area of dentures.

Court of Appeals, 2 circuit judgeships open

Although Democratic and Republican primaries are getting most of the attention, voters Tuesday also will decide two nonpartisan judicial races in Wayne County.

Five candidates are seeking a seat on the state Court of Appeals from the first district, which consists of Wayne, Washtenaw and Livingston counties.

You may vote for one. The two top vote-getters will face off on Nov. 2, with the winner replacing the retiring Nathan J. Kaufman for a six-year term.

COURT OF Appeals candidates, and their statements to the League of Women Voters, are:

Thomas J. Brennan, 59, of Dearborn, a Wayne County circuit judge. He is a former labor arbitrator and former president of the State Board of Education.

Brennan suggests that the courts allow criminal appeals "as a matter of right to capital offenses only." He also would "assess costs to parties who fail to timely respond to discovery pleadings."

Geraldine Bledsoe Ford, 55, a Detroit Recorder's Court judge since 1967. She is a former assistant U.S. at-

torney and former assistant corporation counsel for the city of Detroit.

Ford said the court should "move expeditiously, judges should understand the values embodied in the law so that the purpose as well as the express language of the law will be understood and applied."

Roman S. Gribbs, 55, of Detroit, a Wayne circuit judge. He was sheriff of Wayne County, mayor of Detroit Gribbs (1969-73) and president of the National League of Cities.

Gribbs said, "The heavy caseload and resulting delays require efficient docket management to expedite appeals." He advocates "strict enforcement of time limits, constant monitoring, utilization of new technology and complete accountability by staff and judges."

Charles Kaufman, 62, of Dearborn Heights, a Wayne circuit judge since 1964 and a Common Pleas judge from 1959-64.

Kaufman advocates "more expeditious appeals to the Court of Appeals, more accountability for judges and a limit on time for appeals."

M. John Shamo, 48, a Detroit Recorder's Court judge and former traffic court referee.

Shamo would "attempt to achieve

more uniformity in decisions, especially in critical matters," and advocates "less judicial legislation and more definitive opinions in interpreting the law."

TWO CIRCUIT judgeships, with six-year terms, are open.

Seven persons are seeking four nominations in the primary. You may vote for two. Top four vote-getters will be on the Nov. 2 ballot. Candidates are:

Martin Baum, 39, of Detroit, an attorney for 15 years.

Ricardo J. Lublinski, 44, a Detroit District Court judge and attorney for 19 years.

John H. Gillis Jr., 30, a Detroit Recorder's Court judge serving his first term and attorney four years.

Robert J. Colombo Jr., 32, of Grosse Pointe, an attorney six years.

Craig S. Strong, 34, a Detroit Recorder's Court judge and attorney nine years.

Richard P. Hathaway, 33, a Detroit Recorder's Court judge and attorney five years.

Helene N. White, 27, a Detroit District Court judge.

The circuit court is a court of general jurisdiction, handling major criminal trials and large civil suits.

Shhh! There's millage on ballot

Hardly anyone is discussing it, but there is a one-mill property tax increase on Tuesday's primary ballot.

Proposal A, if passed, would bring about \$18 million into Wayne County's coffers, enough to cover the projected 1982 deficit.

Even those members of the Board of Commissioners who voted to put it on the ballot aren't campaigning for it.

Instead they hope to prove to the Michigan Municipal Finance Commission they have exhausted every possible method of raising revenue and seek permission to borrow to meet payrolls.

The tax would last one year. One mill equals \$1 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. It would cost the owner of a house with a market value of \$60,000

about \$30 per year, minus a possible state income tax rebate.

IF THE TAX hike is rejected, Wayne County will be unable to meet its payroll in a few weeks.

In June, the Board of Commissioners voted 14-7 to cancel layoffs of 670 employees and see the tax hike instead.

Prior to recinding the layoffs, the board in May had approved the layoffs, hoping the action would encourage \$11 million in wage concessions from county employees. County unions rejected the concessions.

All leading candidates for Wayne County executive in the primary are opposing the millage.

The county faces an estimated \$16.7 million deficit. The deficit is a result of

Exec primary draws to a close

The first Wayne County executive primary campaign ended in a flurry of activity as Livonia Mayor Edward H. McNamara sought to overtake the lead of Sheriff William Lucas among Democratic voters.

McNamara wrapped it up with a series of attacks on Lucas' administration as sheriff. Lucas continued to avoid direct response, concentrating on a religious appeal from his brother, a priest.

Robert FitzPatrick, the county's economic development director, predicted victory in Tuesday's Republican primary.

SCOFFING at McNamara's endorsement by 22 mayors and township supervisors, Lucas said, "My brother and his employer are by far the best kind of support and endorsement I could ask for."

His brother is the Rev. Larry Lucas, a Catholic priest at resurrection Parish in the Harlem section of New York City. The priest flew into Detroit Metropolitan Airport Thursday afternoon for a news conference on behalf of the sheriff.

Meanwhile, Lucas' campaign office announced the sheriff had reached agreement with Detroit Records court officials whereby no inmates now held in Wayne County Jail will be released while the court is closed down next week.

The courts will continue to arraign incoming inmates and identify those eligible for bond, Lucas' campaign office said.

Lucas said he contacted sheriffs in five southeastern Michigan counties to see if they could accommodate any of Wayne's overflow of prisoners, but they could offer no assistance.

IN A SERIES of news releases McNamara:

- Charged Lucas was compromising himself by accepting contributions of \$1,000 to \$2,100 from operators of solid waste landfills in Romulus, Sumpter, Huron, Van Buren, Canon and Belleville. Officials in Sumpter and Romulus said they "don't like the idea of a candidate for county executive being tied to these people."
- Criticized Lucas for accepting "\$227 each month from the county for unsubstantiated car mileage when he actually uses a county car driven by an employee . . . The auditors say that Lucas is the only one (county official) who has the full-time use of a county car and also demands the mileage payment."
- Said that while the county unemployment rate was 14.5 percent, Livonia's is only 7.7 percent. "As mayor of Livonia, I have demonstrated that I know how to improve the economy of a community," he said, citing "800 new businesses and 12,000 new jobs in my 12 years in office. Sheriff Lucas has no experience in dealing with business and the economy."

CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH

ORDINANCE NO. LXXIX

AN ORDINANCE TO REQUIRE THE REMOVAL OF SNOW OR ICE FROM THE SIDEWALKS ABUTTING LOTS OR PREMISES IN THE TOWNSHIP; AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Section 1. Removal of ice and snow. No owner, occupant, agent or person having charge of any house, premises, building or lot shall permit any snow or ice to remain on the sidewalks abutting such house, premises, building or lot longer than 24 hours after any snow or ice has fallen or formed. Where either snow or ice has fallen or formed on any such sidewalks, such owner, occupant, agent or person having charge shall, within 24 hours after the snow or ice has fallen or formed, remove such snow or ice or cause a sufficient quantity of salt, sand or ashes to be strewn on the sidewalks in such a manner as to render such sidewalks safe for persons walking thereon.

Section 2. Definitions. For purposes of this ordinance, "sidewalks" shall be defined as those sidewalks or walks which form a part of a public highway, boulevard, road or street.

Section 3. Penalty. Any person who violates Section 1 of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. Severability. This Ordinance and various parts and sections and clauses thereof, are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, section, paragraph or clause is adjudged invalid, it is hereby provided that the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Section 5. Repeal. All other Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such inconsistencies, hereby repealed.

Section 6. Publication. The Township Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published in the manner required by law.

Section 7. Date of Effect. This Ordinance is hereby declared necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the Charter Township of Plymouth and is hereby given immediate effect.

This Ordinance was adopted on an emergency basis by the Township Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Plymouth at its regular meeting called and held on the third day of August, A.D., 1982, and was ordered to be given immediate effect following publication in the manner prescribed by law.

Layer ham, cheese and turkey breast between French toast. Place on ungreased baking pan and heat in 400° oven for 15 minutes. Makes 1 sandwich.

FRUITY MUSTARD SAUCE

- 1 jar (12 oz.) damson plum or apple jelly
- 1 jar (8-1/2 oz.) mango chutney
- 1 cup brown mustard

Pork strips make salad a main dish

Surely one of the most fun food categories for the creative cook is main-dish salads. The mix-and-match combinations of meats, vegetables, fruits and dressings are almost endless.

Just when you think you've tried all the salad possibilities, along comes another — like Layered Pork Salad. It's a unique creation that's sure to spark appetites at any luncheon or supper.

Thin strips of cooked pork are the star ingredient in this salad that layers fresh spinach leaves, blanched cauliflowerettes and alfalfa sprouts. Apricot halves offer a bright, colorful note while chopped pecans add a crunch. Since this salad brings together so many flavors, a simple red wine vinegar and oil dressing serves well to blend them.

While the salad is pleasing palates, it can also help stretch the food dollar when made with leftover pork. All will agree that leftovers never tasted better. You'll want to plan ahead for this salad when preparing a pork roast such as a blade, center rib or loin, sirloin or top loin. When deciding the size roast you'll need, you can count on 2-2½ servings per pound for bone-in cuts and

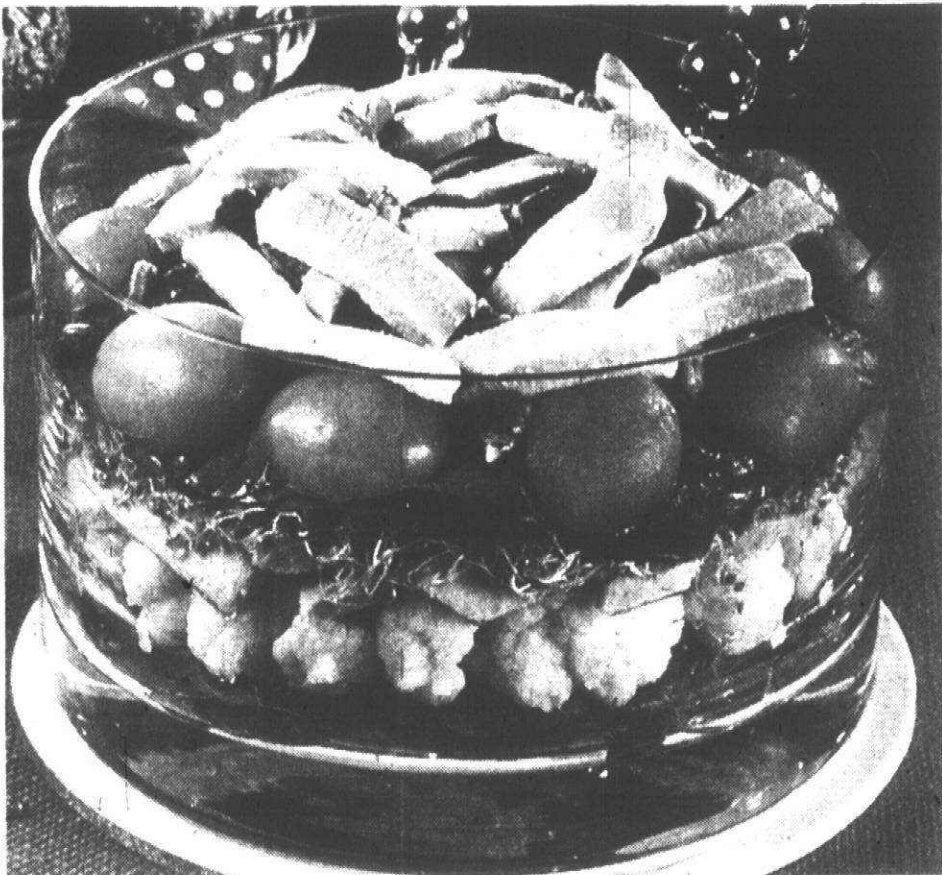
3-3½ servings per pound for boneless cuts.

For leftover pork with optimum flavor and eating quality, it is important that the pork roast be properly prepared. It should be placed on a rack in an open roasting pan and cooked in a slow oven. For the most juicy, tender results, the roast should be cooked only to an internal temperature of 170 degrees as indicated on a roast meat thermometer.

The leftover pork should be left in large pieces and promptly wrapped and placed in the refrigerator. Cooked pork can be safely stored in the refrigerator for four to five days or in the freezer for two to three months.

One of the joys of a main dish salad is the ease with which the accompanying menu can be completed. Simply serve Layered Pork Salad with warm raisin-bran muffins and a dessert of fresh strawberry sundaes.

LAYERED PORK SALAD
¾-1 lb. cooked pork, cut into thin strips
¾ tsp. salt
¾ tsp. pepper
1 lb. spinach



2 cups cauliflowerettes, blanched
1 cup alfalfa sprouts, rinsed and drained
1 can (8¾ oz.) apricot halves, drained
¼ cup coarsely chopped pecans
½ cup red wine vinegar
½ cup oil

Sprinkle salt and pepper over pork. Tear spinach into bit size pieces; place

half in bottom of a 6-cup glass bowl. Place cauliflowerettes over spinach, then add half of the pork strips and the alfalfa sprouts. Place remaining spinach on top of alfalfa sprouts. Arrange apricot halves on top of spinach; top with remaining pork strips. Garnish with chopped nuts, if desired. Combine red wine, vinegar and oil; pour over salad. Cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours. Makes 4 servings.

FINE FELINES from across the country and Canada are being groomed for the big championship cat show this Saturday and Sunday at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Dearborn.

Each summer since 1955, the Michigan Affiliate of the American Diabetes Association has conducted a camp program for youngsters with diabetes. The goal is to provide the fun of camping while teaching them that they can participate in all youthful activities as long as those activities are 'dove-tailed' with sound nutritional and medical practices.

Camp for young diabetics is place to talk it over

The rap sessions scheduled at Camp Midicha have become one of the most meaningful activities counselors provide for the 100 or so young diabetics they meet each week throughout the summer.

"Our job is to get them to open up, get them to talk about how they feel about themselves and their problem," said Jill Cole, speaking for the counselors.

"Our job is to ask the right questions to start the discussion rolling, and I know them all," the Birmingham resident said.

Cole, who finished her degree in social work at Wayne State University this spring, has been a diabetic for 19 years. She's spent many of her childhood summers in Camp Midicha, and like many of her counterparts, returned as an adult to help youngsters — as she was helped.

"We didn't have the rap sessions when I was this age," she said speaking of her 8- to 12-year-old charges this summer. "But I had the same secret feelings that I'm now able to help these campers voice."

"So many have no one at home their own age to talk to about how they feel."

IF CAMP Midicha, which takes its name from the words Michigan Diabetes Children's Association, had a motto, it would undoubtedly be 'Accent the Positive.'

"Returning campers are the happiest thing that can happen to us," said Mary Lutzo, who is now resource person for the counselors.

"When we see them coming back, we know we've done something right. We've helped them cope and they're doing it without bitterness. You can't ask more out of a week at camp."

The Southfield resident, who is earning an education degree at Michigan State University, has been a diabetic for 16 years. Her summer job is evaluating how the counselors "are helping the kids grow," she said.

Both counselors and staff, the large majority of whom are diabetics, are hired because their own lifestyle acts as a model for the campers.

Orientation for the staff is given late in June with the across-the-board philosophy:

"I can do anything I want as long as I take care of myself," Lutzo said.

"Every activity is very carefully planned. Everything you see going on is timed to instill the daily discipline that is required to balance insulin injections with diet and exercise," she said.

WHAT THE visitor sees going on is much the same as in any summer camp for youngsters: swimming, canoeing, campfires, groups involved in making crafts or studying nature.

But a group spotted making cookies for a late-night snack was also being given a running commentary on the food content of that recipe.

Another group had swimming time called to a halt because it was time for a glass of juice because on the beach.

And all camp activities are called to a halt four times a day so the campers can have their urine checked.

Camp Midicha is in its 28th season with a six-week schedule in the lower peninsula near Columbiaville and a 10-week schedule in the upper peninsula near Big Bay.

The medical and program staffs make it possible for diabetic children to enjoy the rewards of a fun camping experience paying attention to their dietary and medical needs while the youngsters are constantly learning more about themselves and their diabetes.

Each camp receives about 100 campers a week. Statistically more females than males suffer from diabetes and though cabins are assigned for girls

and boys according to that ratio, there is often a waiting list for the young girls.

Michigan Elks Association provides campships to see that more than 100 get to Camp Midicha each year, and doctors and nurses who make up the medical staff come, for the most part, as volunteers.

CAMP MIDICHA is sponsored and operated by Diabetes Association-Michigan affiliate. The association is a voluntary health agency, concerned with the detection, care and education,

is headquartered at 23100 Providence Drive, Southfield.

It is the association's belief that learning about the condition, learning to live with it, talking about it, learning to deal with the uneducated and sharing, will strengthen the youth into mentally and physically healthy adults.

It serves about 250,000 diabetics in Michigan.



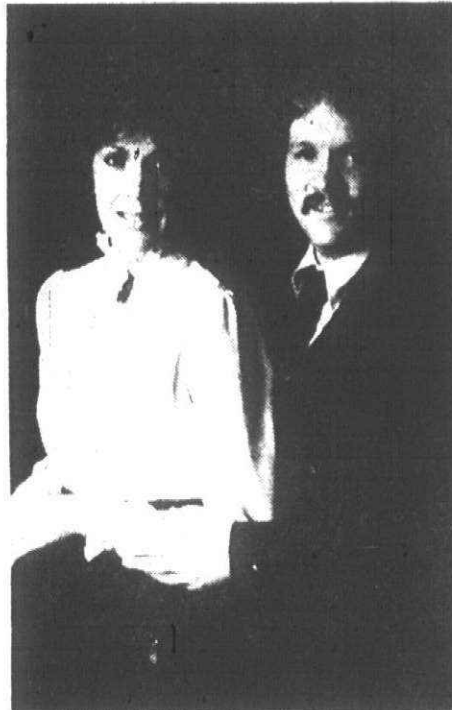

'Zany 'Night Shift' propels a nebbish into fast-paced life

"Night Shift" (R) is a sleeper, and I don't mean dull. It's unexpectedly lively and funny.

It slipped into town with no hoopla or fanfare, none of the multi-million-dollar hype that has become almost ordinary. On the surface, it wouldn't seem to merit much hoopla.

It stars Henry Winkler whose previous movies haven't been blockbusters and who is getting a bit mature to still be playing "the Fonz" on "Happy Days." It was directed by Ron Howard, also of the "Happy Days" gang. What? Howard, a director? And it was written by Lowell Ganz and Babaloo Mandel. Don't ask me who they are.

So this is a movie you go to without any terrific expectations. That, of course, added to the pleasure of discovering this nifty, little, unprepossessing movie. Not the greatest thing since sprockets were punched into film, but not bad.

WINKLER DEVELOPS a character totally opposite from his television role. Charles Lumley is a spineless, neurotic, sweet nebbish. He can't handle any stressful situation. He is easily intimidated. He is always on the receiving end of every insult life has to offer.

He can't walk to his apartment without a vicious dog chasing him. A blind musician harasses him. The neighborhood restaurant never gets his order right. His girlfriend (Gina Hecht) is more interested in losing weight than making love, and the only thing that interests her more than losing weight is eating a Nestle Crunch.

Chuck works the night shift at the city morgue. It's a nice quiet job, or it would be except for Billy Blaze (Michael Keaton), the new man hired to work with Chuck.

Billy is the opposite of Chuck. He's a brash, fast-talking human dynamo. He also is "an idea man," and one of his ideas proves to be wildly successful. He convinces Chuck of the advantages of running a call-girl operation from the morgue.

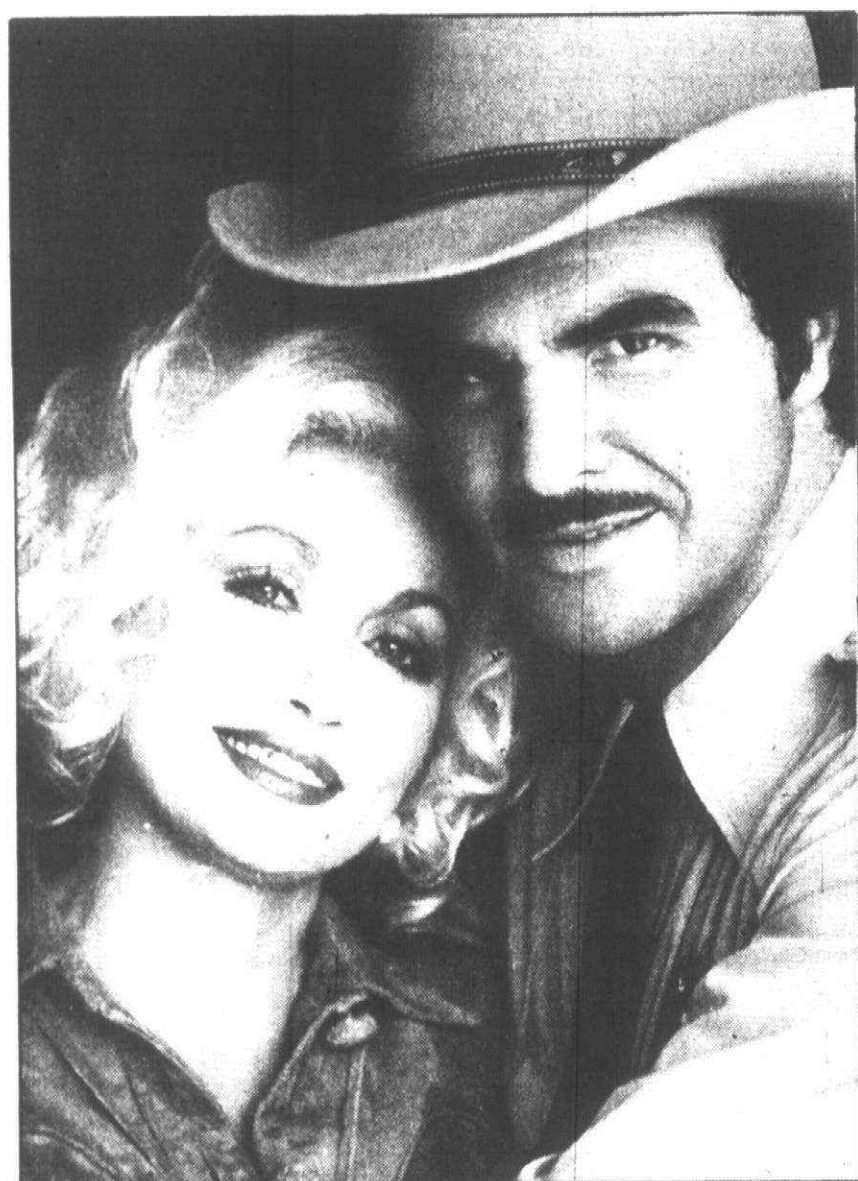
Chuck handles the incoming calls and manages the money. Billy chauffeurs the women to their destinations.

THERE ARE complications, however. Chuck falls for one of the girls, Belinda (Shelley Long), and suffers guilt pangs because he is still engaged. He worries about the morality of being a "love broker." And last but not least, some muscle-men are after Chuck and Billy for not cutting in the local rackets boss on their operation.

The comedy does lose some of its sparkle in the last half, but it is still a little gem. The humor is bright and clever, with more than a hint of Woody Allen in the neurotic character of Chuck.

Keaton as the crazy extrovert Billy is a perfect foil for Winkler's Chuck, and Shelley Long is both sexy and sweet as the prostitute and Chuck's lover.

Because of the plot, it's important to point out that "Night Shift" is not a sleazy movie. It is not sexy, and it is not filled with nudity or bad language. It's just whacky, inventive and a lot of fun.

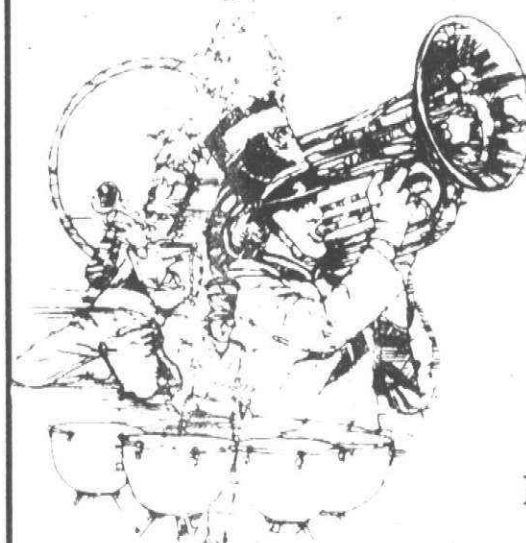

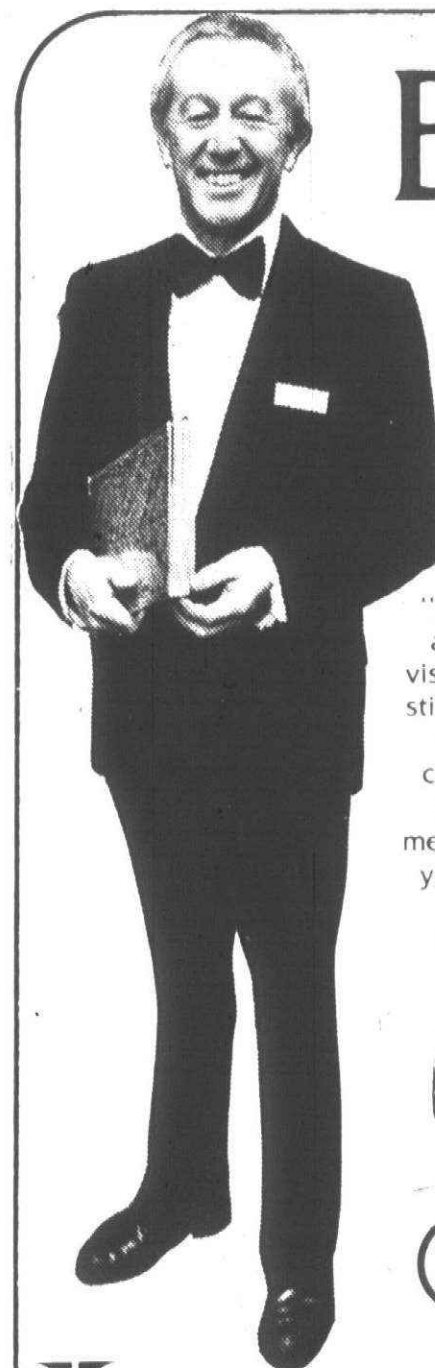

Livonia hangs on to claim Adray playoff title

If something comes easy, it's never as appreciated as a goal accomplished after a hard-fought, difficult struggle.

Livonia Adray team members may agree with that now, but no doubt they would have opted for the easier route Friday night instead of the tumultuous trek to the winners' circle they were forced to follow.

The Livonia team blew leads of six and five runs before finally forcing a pesky Westland-Redford Adray squad to succumb, 10-9 at Ford Field in a game that decided who would represent the circuit at the AAABA national tournament in Johnstown, Pa., starting Aug. 16.

MIKE SCHNEIDER, who had struck out twice in four previous trips to the plate and was hitless on the evening, blooped a soft single to center field with the bases loaded and two out in the ninth to drive in the winning run.

Schneider's hit saddled Westland-Redford reliever Ralph Scharf with the loss. Scharf started the inning taking over for Brad George, who had hurled 6½ effective innings in relief of starter Dave Czarnota.

Scharf had control problems, however, walking the bases full before Schneider delivered his game-winning hit.

Martin Vucinaj, the third Livonia pitcher, went the final 1½ innings to earn the win.

"Nothing seems to come easy for us," said a happy Ron Hellier, the Livonia Adray coach. "But you have to give them (Westland-Redford) credit. They played 18 long innings out there."

The Westland-Redford squad, coming out of the loser's bracket, beat Michigan National Bank, 6-3, earlier Friday to qualify to play Livonia. Had the Westland-Redford team beat Livonia, it would have had to play Livonia again Saturday, something the team's coach, Rodger George, said would have been difficult.

"WE THREW everybody we had at them tonight," George admitted, adding, "But we never gave in. These guys came back and went out in style."

That they did. Livonia struck quickly, scoring six runs (five unearned) in the first two innings.

Larry Mulka hit Czarnota's first pitch over the left field fence and, with two out and a man on, Nino Devitis sent another of Czarnota's deliveries into the trees beyond left field 3-0 lead after one inning.

An error, a wild pitch and a Mulka single got Livonia its first run of the

second. Bill Kopanakis doubled Mulka home and Ken Lowery's base hit got Kopanakis across for a 6-0 Livonia lead.

But Westland-Redford stormed back with four runs in the fifth, thanks in part to a pair of Livonia errors. Joe Humphries, a Plymouth Salem grad, singled in one run and Al Rasky brought in two others with a single.

LIVONIA ADDED a run in the sixth on Mulka's third hit, a triple, and pushed in two more in the seventh on a single by Devitis and a bounce out by Dave Slavin, another Salem alumnus.

But Westland-Redford rallied again in the eighth. Livonia starter Mike Tetreault surrendered a one-out single to George and John Recker was summoned from the bullpen.

Westland-Redford hammered Recker. John Hetkowski doubled and scored on Kevin Stanicz's single, then Recker walked a pair to load the bases. That brought Vucinaj in from the pen.

Tony DeMare greeted Vucinaj with a triple to right, bringing in three more runs and tying the score at 9-all. DeMare tried to score the go-ahead run moments later on Steve Gray's bouncer to short, but Mulka threw him out at the plate.

Mulka and Devitis each drove in three runs with three hits for Livonia. The winners finished with 10 hits in the game, five for extra bases.

DeMare had three hits and three RBI for Westland-Redford. Humphries and George collected two hits apiece, as Westland-Redford totalled 11 hits in the game.

LIVONIA ADRAY qualified for Friday's final on the strength of its 2-0 shutout of Michigan National Bank in the second-round of the league playoffs Wednesday.

Larry Walker threw one-hit baseball against MNB to pick up the victory.

Walker pitched 8½ innings, striking out seven and walking three.

Recker came in and pitched to one batter and finished off Michigan National in the ninth inning to pick up the save.

Steve Peters pitched seven innings for the losing team, with Bob Warren relieving Peters in the eighth. Peters had fanned seven in his stint and Warren struck out three and walked two.

Livonia started the game out by scoring a run in its half of the first inning.

MULKA AND Ken Surcina each reached base by way of bases on balls and Mulka scored on an RBI single off the bat of DeVitis.

That was the only score until the sixth inning, when Livonia drew blood again.

Surcina ripped a lead-off single and wound up on second base following a ground out. A single by Slavin drove Surcina home with the final tally of the game.

Livonia Adray had two runs on six hits and committed two errors while Michigan National Bank had no runs, one hit and committed one error.

DEARBORN VACUUM lost its second consecutive Adray League tournament extra inning game as Westland-Redford came from behind to defeat Dearborn, 6-5, in 11 innings.

Dearborn started the game by picking up two runs in the first inning, adding one in the second and two more in the fourth and cruised into the bottom of the ninth inning with a 5-0 lead.

But Dearborn starter Charles Johnson, who had a one-hitter going into the bottom half of the ninth inning, could not get out a batter and was pulled from the game after Westland-Redford scored three runs.

Rick Giese came in to relieve Johnson and was tagged with the loss.

Giese threw three innings and gave up two runs on three hits, walked three and did not strike out a batter.

George, in relief of starter Dan Funkhouser, got credit for the victory.

GEORGE DID NOT allow a run in three innings of work and he allowed only one hit and one walk while striking out five.

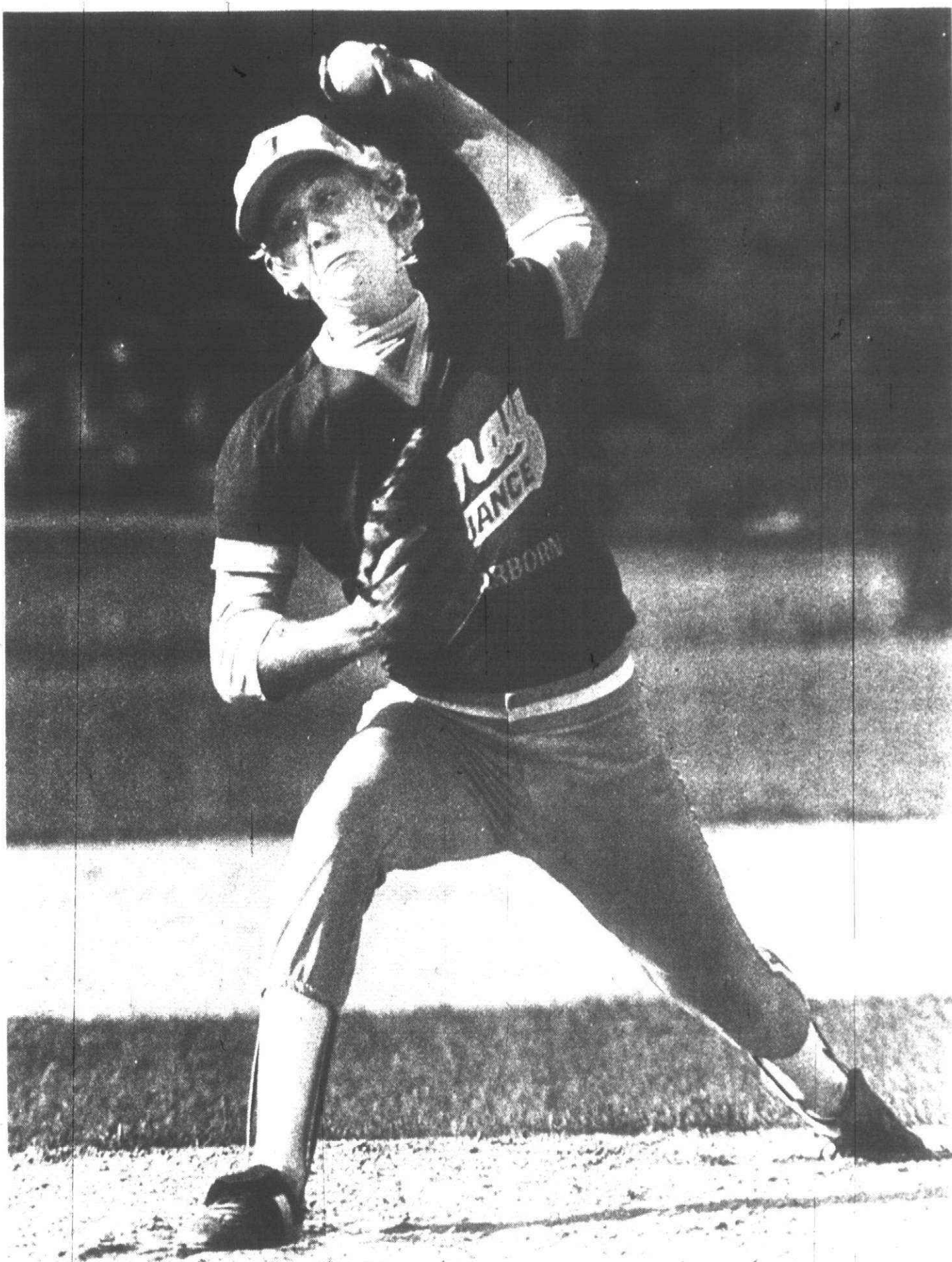
Funkhouser gave up five runs on nine hits, walked five and struck out four, during his eight innings of work.

Westland scored its winning run in the bottom of the ninth on an error on the Dearborn third baseman.

Westland's Gray led off the inning with a double and was sacrificed to third by DeMare. After a pop out, Humphries was intentionally walked to set up a force play at second. Rasky hit the ball to third and the throw was off its mark, scoring Gray with the winning run.

Dearborn Vacuum had five runs on 10 hits and committed three errors while Westland-Redford had six runs on six hits and also committed three errors.

Dearborn Vacuum finished its season at 13-19-1.

"I love it! I think it's great," he said.

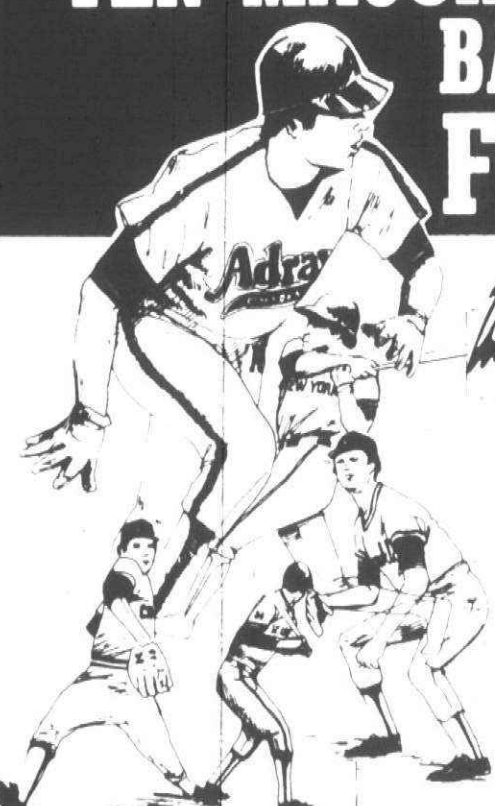
Currently, the Minnesota Twins are mired in last place in the American League Western Division, 22½ games out of first place.
