## The Canton Connection

**PUBLICATION PROBLEMS** with our presses caused the splitting of the news section in Thursday's Canton Observer. Some news pages, slotted for Section A, appeared in Section D instead. These pages included a number of letters to the editor. We regret the complication.

**OVERDUE LIBRARY BOOKS** must be returned, according to Deborah O'Connor of the Canton Public Library.

People who are racking up overdue notices on library books might want to return those books or face a more costly alternative. Penalty for failing to return library books is a \$500 fine.

"Letters are going out now to people who have ignored three or four notices and phone calls," said O'Connor. "These are people with multiple overdues — for six months or more. Our goal is to retrieve books and save taxpayers' money."

**SUE WRENBECK** was appointed by the Township Board to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Her term expires in August 1985.

Cathy Prince, who earlier served on the zoning board, was named to the planning commission. Prince replaces Dianne Neihengen. The term ends in December 1984.

**TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS** and their attorneys still seem confused when following the state Opening Meetings Act. The Township Board scheduled a special meeting last Monday, another in a series of sessions regarding Treasurer Maria Sterlini and the employees in her department.

Sterlini requested that the Monday meeting be open, although she asked that the previous four sessions be closed, which is allowed by the act. But some board members told residents the Monday session would be closed — not open — before attending the session.

The board then decided to adjourn the open Monday meeting — delaying a decision on the issue until Tuesday's regular board meeting where a large crowd attended.

**THE TOWNSHIP** Board regularly meets on the first, second and fourth Tuesdays of each month. Meetings begin at 7 p.m. at Township Hall, on Canton Center south of Cherry Hill. ## State slashes schools' budget

School officials knew the state would send bad news, but they never expected the budget ax to cut this deeply.

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools lost an estimated \$1,369,200 in financial aid last week after the state adopted a new school funding formula.

The district received \$126 per student last school year, but now will receive only \$42 per student in state aid this year, according to Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business.

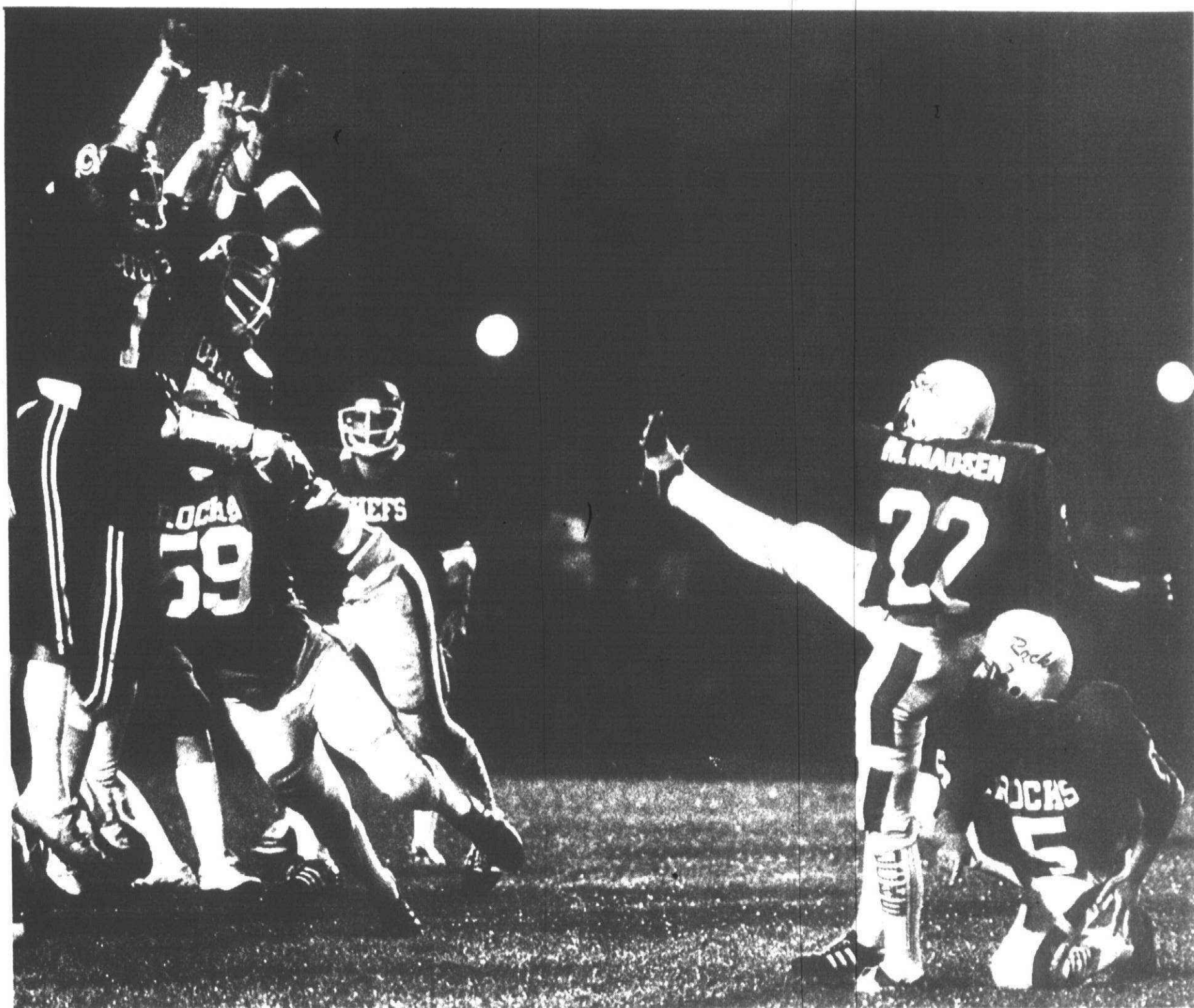
"We knew we would lose some money because they'd weaken the formula, but we were surprised they weakened the formula that much," Hoedel said.

"We thought, based on the best advice, that we were getting (cut) over \$700,000, but it ended up over \$1 million."

State aid figures are based on a projected enrollment of 16,300 in schools and adult education, Hoedel said. This figure may change after the fourth Friday of this month, when "D-Day" enrollment counts are taken.

**THE SCHOOLS' FINANCIAL** picture looks even bleaker with the latest state report on an executive order cut from the governor's office. This cut means \$855,971 loss to the Plymouth-Canton budget, Hoedel said, although these monies may be returned by the state next year. Plymouth-Canton originally budgeted a \$300,000 loss in other executive order cuts.

## Hearing slated for proposed tax hike

A public hearing on a proposed tax increase for police services will take place Tuesday at the Township Board meeting.

The board has decided to keep the same tax rate for fire protection and general fund budgets in 1983. Board members would be increasing the police tax slightly.

It was originally proposed to keep the same tax rate as last year for police protection. But trustees voted to increase the tax, based on increased demands for service.

Police Chief Jerry Cox maintains the additional 0.482 mills is needed to provide a financial cushion, avoid layoffs and make some purchases next year.

Last year's tax level would yield \$44,000 more in revenues because of increases in the state equalized valuation, Cox said. "But because of inflation, we would go into the hole."

"The budget is so tight. We don't con-

trol the volume of our customers. If we don't have any buffer, we would be in rough shape."

**THE TAX INCREASE** would place the police tax rate at 3.65 mills (\$3.65 for every \$1,000 of assessed property valuation, based on half the market value of a house and/or property).

The higher tax would increase police department revenues by 6 percent, or \$230,000, said finance director Mike Gorman. A resident whose house carries a market value of \$60,000 would

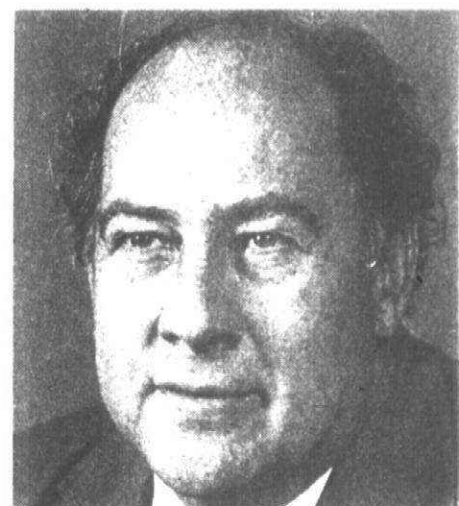
pay about \$12 more with the new rate, said Gorman.

The budget allows few, if any, salary increases. Cox said. The patrolmen's contract expired July 1. Police (and firefighters) could request an arbitrator to set a higher wage.

"If they go to arbitration, they will get a raise," said Cox. "They are 18 percent below (the wages in) surrounding communities. If that (raise) happens, we end up laying people off."

Supervisor James Poole said any in-

## Police chief explains division's needs

Police Chief Jerry Cox believes it's time for some hard decisions about badly-needed capital expenditures.

The proposed 1983 police budget includes no allocations for new police cars, tightened security for the prisoner lockup area or an improved telephone system.

The Township Board is considering increasing the police tax to 3.65 mills (\$3.65 for every \$1,000 of assessed valuation). That adds up to an increase of 0.482 mills over last year's rate.

The chief believes that increase, if approved, will maintain the current

level of services and allow a small financial "cushion." The department has experienced increased demand for services in recent years.

The township board will hold a public hearing on the proposed tax on Tuesday, and formally adopt the tax rate at a future meeting.

Meanwhile, Cox has outlined his "priority list" of equipment needs for the next year, about \$122,000 worth.

"I'm trying to get (the board) to make some decision within the next couple weeks," said Cox. "I'm asking that they buy from this year's federal

revenue-sharing funds."

Cox noted the federal revenue-sharing program may expire in 1983. In the past, Canton used these funds for most of its capital purchases.

In the chief's view, police equipment is more important than buying grass seed for soccer fields — a current allocation for some of the revenue-sharing dollars.

"It may be that the township has to look at its spending priorities concerning revenue-sharing, in view that it might not be there (in the future)," said Cox. "If it comes down to a choice be-

tween soccer fields and cars, we should have police cars."

**THE POLICE** priority list includes:

- Six new patrol cars, at an estimated cost of \$57,000. The department would replace some of the cars which have logged 65,000-70,000 miles, said Cox.

- Twenty-two new portable radio batteries, at \$1,650. Most of the present batteries have been in use more than one year, and the chief considers them unreliable.

## Prison escapee caught after numerous house burglaries

Police have arrested a 32-year-old Jackson escapee in connection with between 50-75 home burglaries in a three-county region since July.

John M. Hainer, who was convicted and sentenced on a Southfield armed robbery charge last July 9, stood mute on one count of breaking and entering Thursday in Plymouth's 35th District Court. Judge Dunbar Davis set his preliminary exam date for Thursday. He is being held on \$20,000 bond.

But local police officers believe more warrants and charges will follow.

As of late last week, police said Hainer will be charged with other breaking and enterings of homes in Canton Township, Brighton, Saline, and Detroit, in addition to an escape charge.

The four Canton break-ins occurred during daylight hours Sept. 14 on Hanford, Ridge, Napier and Beck roads. The items reported stolen included coins, silver, and a VHF recorder, Canton police said.

At least three of the 50 burglaries Hainer confessed committing occurred in Livonia, said Sgt. Robert Hoover of the Livonia Detective Bureau. Plymouth police believe Hainer stole a total

of some \$200,000 of goods. The items included cash, guns, jewelry, silverware, and television sets.

**THE BREAK-INS** all occurred since Hainer walked away from a Jackson State trusty farm July 20, according to police. He was serving a five-to-20-year sentence at the time of the escape, police said.

Hainer was arrested Wednesday night at the Detroit home of his girlfriend on Grayfield Street. His arrest was the result of investigations conducted by police agencies in Wayne, Washtenaw and Livingston counties.

Hainer and a unidentified partner

● A \$6,000 prisoner security system, which might include closed-circuit television for the cell areas. Two prisoners have tried suicide in the past two months, and Cox expressed concerns about liability.

The department already has acted to reduce the prisoner load. As of Sept. 1, prisoners aren't being accepted from other police agencies.

● Four civilian dispatchers, at an estimated first-year wage package of \$78,000. This would free sworn officers for other duties.

● A new telephone system, replacing the current one which often back-

logs. Estimated cost is \$22,000.

"The calls on the non-emergency line stack up," said Cox. "The phone keeps ringing, which annoys callers."

Callers then phone the emergency number, jamming those lines.

"The existing system undermines and jeopardizes the police effectiveness," said Cox.

● Logging tape-recording system, to keep a record of all phone calls, a protection for police and residents.

In addition, the police station is in "deplorable" condition, said Cox. Long-range goals for the department will include either constructing a new building, or making renovations to the existing one.

performed the house burglaries during the daytime, usually between the hours of 11 a.m. and 4 p.m., according to Plymouth Lt. Robert Commire.

"They would bang on the door to see if anyone was home and then break in. They would take the silverware from downstairs and go upstairs to get jewelry and cash. It was in and out real quick," says Commire.

On Sept. 7 Hainer and his partner broke into a Plymouth home they thought was unoccupied, police said. Once inside, the two were confronted by a woman living in the house.

Police confirmed Hainer's identity based on a description given by the woman. Even before then, however, Hainer was being sought.

According to Hoover, a Redford Township police detective had spotted Hainer in Redford earlier last week but lost him after a brief chase. "As soon as he (Sgt. Edwin Oswald) told me that, I called Plymouth, who had an eyewitness," said Hoover. "Until then, every-

body thought he was still in Jackson."

Combining efforts with other local police agencies, a surveillance team was set up. Intelligence bureau officers from Livonia and Canton, working the first shift of the surveillance, made the arrest Wednesday night, hours after four Canton Township homes were burglarized. Hainer later confessed to these break-ins, said Hoover.

Since the arrest, Hainer has been transported to different local police departments where he is reported to have made confessions for some 50 home burglaries.

Canton police will charge Hainer with four counts of breaking and entering and suspect he is responsible for more, according to Canton Chief Jerry Cox.

Hoover said police did not recover any stolen property except for a stolen van from Novi. Police will be contacting the affected homeowners this week, he added.

Breaking and entering with intent to commit larceny carries a maximum sentence of 15 years in jail.

# Man, 80, beaten, robbed

Canton police are investigating an apparent beating and robbery of an 80-year-old Taylor man early Sunday.

According to Lt. Dennis Joker, an officer found the elderly man — bleeding about his head and face — at 5:07 a.m. Sunday on Washburn, near Michigan Avenue.

The tires of the man's 1974 Dodge

were slashed, according to reports. The man told police he had been robbed of \$700 and a television set which had been in his car.

The victim, who was intoxicated, was taken to Oakwood Hospital, where he spent several hours under observation, said Joker.

Police have not determined where the attack took place.

creased taxes should be used for capital expenditures, such as police cars and improvements to the police station.

"If they raised my taxes to give people raises, I would be furious," Poole said. He believes no raises should be given unless "all the fat" has been trimmed from the budget.

NEXT YEAR'S budget must be adopted by Oct. 31. It goes into effect Jan. 1.

Currently budgeted are \$1.5 million for fire services and \$1.8 million for police protection, including the tax increase. Each is paid from a separate tax authorized by voters several years ago.

The general fund, which covers most

of the township's operating expenses, budgets spending \$3.4 million.

Last week, the Township Board adopted new tax rates of 3.06 mills for the fire fund and 2.24 for general fund. Both were reductions from last year's levels.

Few people commented about the proposed tax rates. Last year, residents expressed satisfaction about fire protection, but feared cuts in the police services.

CANTON NOW has 32 sworn police officers, 11 part-time volunteer reserve officers and six clerical employees.

Cox will recommend that many of the large capital purchases — police cars and new equipment — come from

current federal revenue-sharing aid, he said.

But if that aid dries up in 1983, local taxes will have to absorb some of the future expenditures, Cox believes.

"I think (the increase) will allow us to get some equipment, so we can get by with existing personnel. We would be more cost-effective. We have to budget now, for (purchases) next year."

The police tax rate will be set at a later meeting of the Township Board.

STILL UNDETERMINED is the eventual effect of a public safety plan being considered in Canton.

Such a plan could have a big effect on police and fire services. Variations range from a joint dispatch system, to

more elaborate plans in which police and firefighters perform both functions.

The Township Board recently approved the formation of a public-safety study committee. Members will include the directors of personnel and finance, representatives of the police and fire unions, police and fire chief, and representatives from the community.

Trustee Robert Padgett suggested that the group come up with long- and short-range recommendations, then outline a plan.

"I envision this committee to have a broad, big responsibility," said Padgett. "I don't want to see the committee get tied up for the next 18 months."

# Rival utility case plans up to voters, courts

A battle is shaping up in the courts and at the polls between the state's utilities and a consumer group over gas and electric costs.

Utility companies, with support from organized labor, argue that a Michigan Citizens Lobby ballot proposal would slow prompt recovery of operating costs and eventually weaken the state's troubled economy.

The MCL's plan will go before voters as Proposal D Nov. 2. Michael Blombach, public affairs director of Consumers Power Co., says it will cost the company millions in interests charges and stifle construction jobs. Organized labor agrees.

The utilities support a rival plan, Proposal H, placed on the ballot by the Michigan Legislature. Joe Tuchinsky, executive director of MCL, calls it "devoid of content . . . it changes nothing."

Both groups argued their cases recently in a meeting with Observer & Eccentric Newspapers editors.

**BOTH PROPOSALS** would prohibit so-called "automatic pass-throughs" by which utilities adjust rates when the cost of the gas and coal they buy goes up or down. Such rate changes would be subject to hearings by the state Public Service Commission.

There the similarity ends.

Proposal D would limit the PSC to hearing one rate increase case per utility product at a time. Companies which deal with more than one utility are permitted a case for each utility. (Separate cases would be permitted for policy questions unrelated to rate increases.)

At present, Detroit Edison Co., for one, has 22 cases pending before the

PSC, said Edison attorney Christopher Wren. He likened the situation to 22 rail lines coming into Detroit and all being forced to converge on a single track.

**THE UTILITIES** and unions, organized as Michigan Citizens for Jobs and Energy, are fighting to place on the Nov. 2 ballot their counter-proposal, H. It doesn't restrict the number of rate cases the PSC can hear.

The controversy has pitted the AFL-CIO, construction trades and utility workers unions against MCL, which Tuchinsky said usually has union backing.

MCL is appealing to the Michigan Supreme Court a decision by the state Court of Appeals to place the second proposal on the ballot.

A third measure in the state Legislature is intended as a complement to both Proposals D and H. It is House Bill 5527, and it is expected to be acted upon by the Senate within the next few weeks. It would require the PSC to conduct hearings and vote on attempts by the utilities to pass on increased costs to consumers through rate hikes.

The bill provides money for consumer groups to present their side in cases concerning cost recovery, said Tuchinsky. However, funds aren't available to consumer groups for general rate cases.

That bill deals with a problem MCL seeks to solve through Proposal D. If utilities are forced to consolidate their rate increase cases into one, consumer groups, with limited staffs and funds, gain time to raise money to argue their side of a case, Tuchinsky argued.

**UTILITY COMPANIES** and unions fear that limiting rate increases to a single case will prevent utilities from passing on to consumers in a timely fashion their increased energy and

heating costs, said Blombach.

In Michigan, it takes 12-18 months for the PSC to hear a rate case, Blombach said. By piling all rate problems into a single case, the PSC would soon have a backlog. On top of that, fuel prices fluctuate monthly, he said.

The result: Utilities would have to borrow money to pay for their natural gas and coal while waiting for the PSC to approve a rate increase.

Blombach said his company alone has \$326 million in rate cases pending before the PSC — four times the firm's annual \$85 million net earnings from gas sales.

"Going out and borrowing \$326 million at about 13 1/4 percent interest over a 12-month period adds about \$44 million to the cost of that fuel," he said.

That cost would be passed on to consumers. Instead of lowering customers' costs, Blombach argues, Proposal D would ultimately raise them.

"We need to at least recover our costs. In other words, we can't buy high and sell low and stay in business," said Blombach.

Currently, Consumers Power spends 72 cents from every \$1 of revenue to buy gas and 49 cents of the \$1 of electric revenue to buy fuel, Blombach said.

**BUT PASSAGE** of Proposal D wouldn't automatically result in losses for the utilities and customers, according to Tuchinsky.

The proposal would allow utilities to recover their operating costs in a timely way, he said, because midway through the case, the PSC usually grants an interim adjustment which gives the utilities most of what they're asking.

The PSC bases its projected rates on carefully analyzed estimates of the coming year, he said. Thus, those rates

are intended to be equitable for the entire year.

**THE UTILITIES** and unions fear the MCL proposal would result in a lowering of the companies' credit ratings.

Both the Moody index and Standard & Poor pushed the state's utilities credit rating to the bottom rung of their "investment grade" listing. If the companies slip one step to the "speculative" category, they fear they would have trouble selling shares to prime buyers such as insurance companies and pension funds.

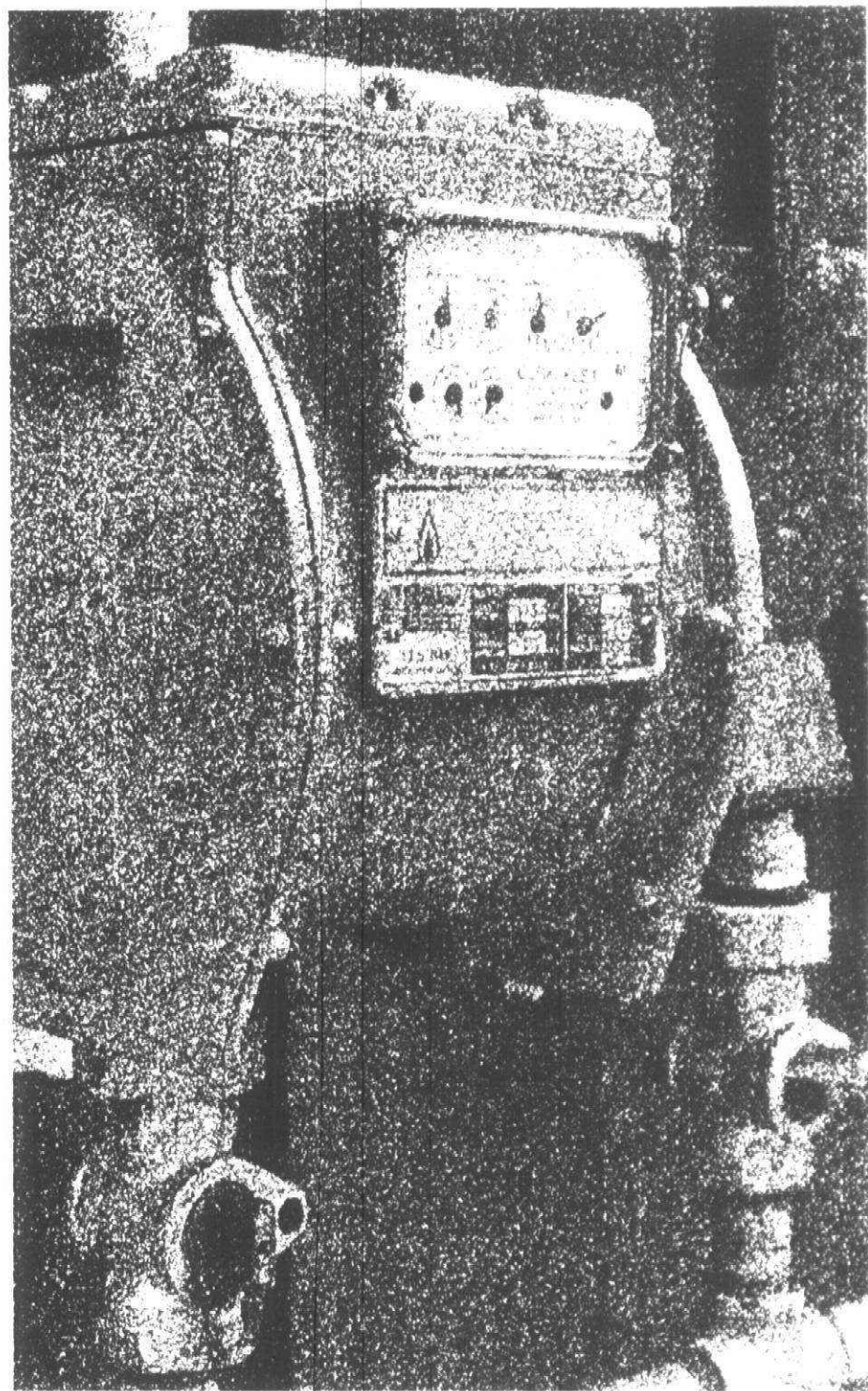
It's this lowering of the companies' credit rating which worries the utility unions and has them rallying to the side of business. They fear the state bond market would nosedive. There would be a domino effect, hitting municipalities and forcing them to lay off workers, according to Keith Tarr-Whelan, labor consultant for Michigan Jobs and Energy.

Municipalities would then plead poverty and demand unions settle for less at bargaining time, Tarr-Whelan said.

Unions also are concerned about the companies' credit ratings because their pension funds are invested in utilities, Tarr-Whelan said.

**TUCHINSKY DENIES** his group is working for the economic demise of the utility companies.

Proposal D would force the utilities to be "lean, mean and bargain hard" when shopping for gas and coal. Automatic pass-throughs, he said, give utilities "minimal incentive to bargain around."



## Opponents differ on utility cases

L. Brooks Patterson likens the progress of state government during the past decade to that made in just one year by three moose hunters.

Patterson, Oakland County prosecutor and Republican candidate for state attorney general, made the analogy during a recent campaign appearance in Novi.

"Each year these three moose hunters would hire a bush pilot to fly them to a remote part of Canada to hunt," said Patterson.

"Well, as they were unloading their

gear from the pontoon plane the pilot warned them, 'I'll be back to pick you up in a week, and remember — because of weight restrictions we can fly with only one moose.'

"A WEEK LATER, the pilot arrives to pick up the hunters and sees that each of them has a moose. Well, the hunters pulled off the same thing they had the year before. Each one kicked in \$200, and for \$600 the pilot agreed to haul all the moose."

"The plane took off but crashed 500 feet away. One hunter said to the others, 'Hey, this is 100 feet further than where we crashed last year.'

"That pretty well describes the progress of government over the last 10 years," said Patterson.

**PATTERSON** and John Anderson, Republican senatorial candidate in the 15th District, appeared before about 100 persons who gathered Wednesday at Weiss Pollution Control Corp. in Novi.

Patterson blamed much of government's ineffectiveness on his opponent, Attorney General Frank Kelley, "who since I took office has been on the wrong side in criminal justice. He's been my opponent for 10 years."

Although Kelley characterizes him-

self as a consumer advocate, Patterson added, Kelley's success rate with consumer issues is dismal.

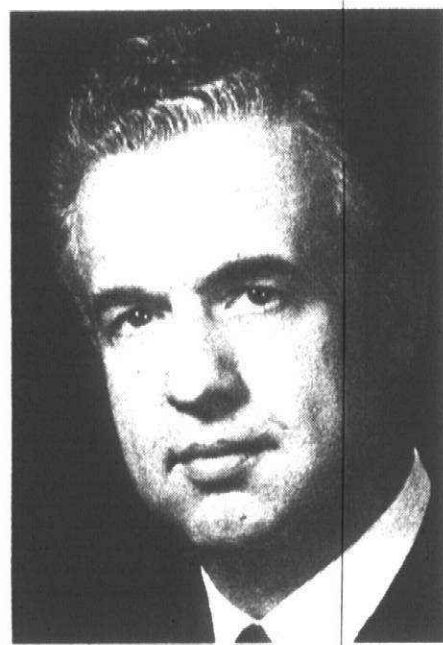
"If you're satisfied with your phone bills, vote for Kelley. He's taken on 40 challenges (consumer advocacy issues) in the courts and lost every one. When you lose 40 out of 40 you're doing something wrong," Patterson said.

He added that "Kelley favors the appointment (versus election) of Public Service Commission."

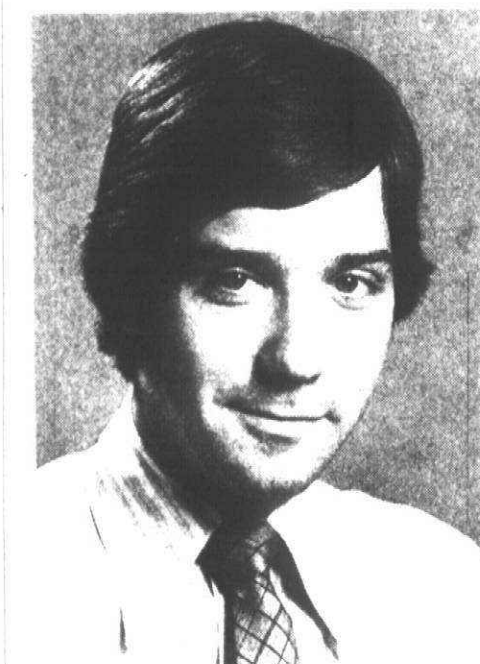

# Schools get bad news from state

Last June, the board approved a \$11-million budget which included a \$1.6-million reduction. No programs were totally eliminated although some services were reduced. The schools' total deficit at that time was \$2.7 million, but the emergency fund balance was reduced from \$1.4 million to \$300,000 to cover the deficit.

A subsequent audit revealed the schools' gained an additional \$235,000

in the fund balance, Hoedel said. Approximately \$200,000 also will be added to the fund balance from insurance credits if the board accepts a new Blue Cross coverage plan October 1, Hoedel added. This plan will not mean a loss of benefits to school employees.

MEANWHILE, negotiations continued between the board and the Plymouth-Canton Education Association (PCEA-the teachers' union) last week. Teachers and six other labor groups

currently are working without a contract.

Both sides met Tuesday and Thursday to clarify budget figures with Hoedel and Norm Kee, assistant superintendent for personnel.

Candi Reece, chief negotiator for the teachers, said her group was concerned about "inequities" in the budget.

Both sides have agreed to use school funds to restore teachers and help reduce class sizes.

"We set aside \$342,000 to make some improvements in class sizes, where needed," Hoedel said.

Some restoration has occurred, and about \$150,000 still remains from those funds, Hoedel said.

Reece believes that figure is about \$190,000, however.

"It's Ray's (Hoedel) budget, and he can move those figures around," Reece said.

# Special meeting called to pick up the pieces

The Wayne-Westland school board, which had a majority of its seven members recalled by voters last week, will meet tonight to try to pick up the pieces.

The board session, to start at 7 p.m. in the central offices on Marquette near Carlson, will have the three remaining officials pick interim officers, particularly a treasurer, and adopt interim bank procedures so the district's routine business can be continued.

The treasurer is especially needed so employees can be paid by the next payroll and bills paid on time.

Recalled by a 58-42 margin last Tuesday were board officers Kenneth Marshall, president, Mary Arbour, vice president, Mildred Batterson, secretary, and Donald Rusnock, treasurer.

The four were voted out of office by people who opposed teacher contract extension and faculty pay raises approved last fall.

THE AGENDA calls for three actions by the remaining board members, Fred Warmbier, Dewey Combs, and David Moranty: appointing an interim treasurer, adopting interim bank procedures and appointing other interim officers.

Trustee Fred Warmbier, who has been on the board for 13 years since his election in 1968, will be named treasurer because there is an existing signature plate on hand from a previous term in that office, he said.

Moranty was elected in 1981. Combs joined the board three months ago.

The three board members have recommended a professional man with "impeccable credentials" to Gov. Wil-

liam Milliken to fill one board vacancy, Warmbier said.

If the man, who Warmbier declined to identify, is appointed by Milliken to the vacancy, then the board would have a quorum and appoint three other people to bring the board up to strength.

THE PERSON recommended by the three board members was not involved in the recall election, Warmbier said. Warmbier didn't meet him until the day after the recall election.

The governor is being asked to move as quickly as possible on the appointment, he said.

Other board members asked him to be board spokesman because of his

seniority, Warmbier said.

The Wayne County board of canvassers is scheduled to meet today to formally certify the election results. When that is done, the four recalled board members will be officially out of office.

IN ANOTHER development in the wake of the recall, state Rep. Sylvia Skrel, R-Westland, has called for candidates to be nominated for the vacancies.

Gov. Milliken will make the appointments soon, based on the recommendation of Joyce Braithwaite of his staff and consultation with others.

Skrel will ask the board to make a

public appeal for candidates at tonight's board session, she said.

The representative, running for a second two-year term in the Nov. 2 election against Democrat Justine Barns, said she wants eight to 12 candidates to submit to the governor for his consideration.

Skrel, who was neutral in the recall campaign, said she wants nominees for the vacancies who are objective and not involved in the recall.

SHE DOESN'T want the appointees running in a special election to be held to fill the balance of the terms on the board.

Skrel, in trying to find people to fill the vacancies, said she will ask for comments from Taxpayers United Together. TUT started the successful recall campaign.

Skrel talked with Supt. Timothy Dyer, who opposed the recall, and the Wayne-Westland Education Association, the teachers' union whose contract extension and pay raises last fall was a factor in the campaign.

Skrel talked to Mayor Charles Pickering, who was neutral in the campaign, for suggestions of potential candidates, she said.

THE MORNING after the recall election, Skrel was contacted by a former board member, Anne Harbison. Harbison asked to be considered for a vacancy.

Active in the Republican Party, Harbison served on the board in the early 1970s before being defeated for re-election.

tion. She is now a half-time secretary for the Garden City Public Schools.

People may submit names and resumes of potential candidates for the vacancies to Gov. Milliken at the state capitol, Lansing 48909, with a copy of the material sent to Skrel.

Although there is no deadline in state law for Gov. Milliken to fill the vacancies, Skrel hopes it would be done within several weeks.

**THE FRACTURED TOOTH**

Every year thousands of people have accidents that cause damage to face and mouth, sometimes resulting in a fractured tooth. It may be caused by an auto accident or sports or an accidental fall at home. Whatever the cause, a fractured tooth presents a serious problem and should be treated by the dentist immediately to prevent infection and loss of the tooth.

If the fracture hasn't penetrated to the pulp of the tooth, the dentist will apply medication to ease the pain and place a temporary cap over the tooth to protect it. Later the tooth will be crowned to restore its appearance.

If the pulp has been exposed by the fracture, the tooth must be treated within 24 hours to prevent infection and other complications. Any pulp that becomes infected will have to be removed to save the tooth. Eventually the pulp will heal when the dentin or inner wall of the tooth knits back together.

Whatever the cause, there should be no delay in seeking treatment when a tooth is fractured.



KELLEY, REACHED reached at his Lansing office, denied the charges.

"To show you the shoddy nature of his research, I have supported the elective Public Service Commission concept for several years, having held more than one press conference on it and making financial contributions to that campaign.

"For my opponent to say I don't support it is flagrant misrepresentation," Kelley said.

Kelley emphasized his 15-year involvement in utility rate regulation and criticized Patterson for his lack of intervention.

"Patterson, as a county official, not only could intervene in cases, but could have sought federal grants on behalf of the county. Wayne County has inter-

vened in many utility cases," said Kelley, who listed victories against Consumers Power, Michigan Bell and other utilities in which millions of dollars in refunds and savings for consumers were obtained, he said.

WHILE THE prosecutor concedes Kelley's 21-year incumbency is a strength, "it's also a weakness. What has he done? Not a whole lot."

Patterson said he'll announce a utility program within the next few weeks which addresses the fact that "82 cents of every dollar paid to utilities goes to pay producers and pipelines. Kelley should be in Washington addressing that."

The November election will boil down to "a resolution of criminal issues and an effective program for regulating utilities," added Patterson.

"THIS ELECTION will be decided on credibility," countered Kelley.

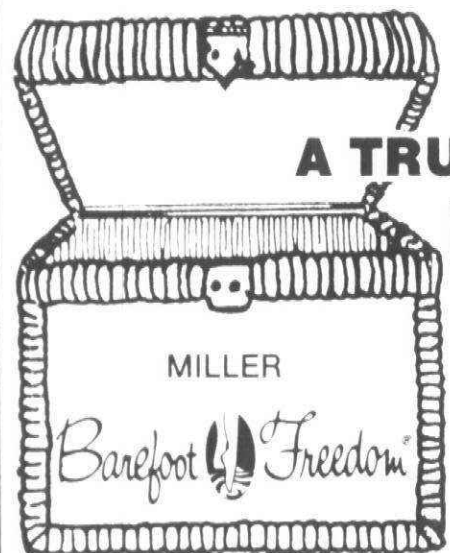
"Who has the credibility to perform this job as attorney for the state? The bottom line is who do you trust to be attorney general?"

While Kelley acknowledges Patterson has fought to reduce plea bargaining and mass paroling, the Democrat charges "he has done nothing to aid the rest of us in law enforcement who must face the reality that we have to have more prisons.

"Two years ago, (Gov.) Milliken and I campaigned all over the state to increase taxes to build more prisons. Patterson didn't join with us. He didn't support the effort to build more prisons.

"As far as I'm concerned he's part of the problem rather than part of the solution."

Kelley opposes capital punishment while Patterson has fought to restore the death penalty for first-degree murder since 1979.

# 1965 college trustee election was a cliff-hanger

(Part XIX)

In June 1965, I was a candidate for election to a four-year, at large term on the board of trustees at Schoolcraft College. My opponent was Rosina Raymond of Livonia.

Raymond, a leader in area Irish organizations, then was a teacher in the Livonia school system. She has served, as I had, on the Education and Action Committee which helped to found the college. She also was co-chairwoman of the Livonia citizens' committee for college millage.

She had campaigned, without success, during the June 1961 election for one of the three at-large seats which were won by Jane Moehle, James O'Neil and Charles Kirkpatrick.

The lone community vacancy in Livonia that year was being sought by a field of six. Harold Fischer, who represented Plymouth, and Clarke Oldenburg, who represented Garden City, were running unopposed. And there was no election that year for local representation from Northville and Clarenceville.

Because ours was the only contest

for an at-large seat (for which voters in all five of the college district communities had a right to vote), the Raymond-versus-Hudson race caught the attention of the voters as well as of the press.

ON THE ONE HAND, I had an advantage as the incumbent, having been appointed by the board nine months before the election to fill the seat vacated by Charles Kirkpatrick.

On the other hand, Rosina Raymond had the advantage of living and working in Livonia, which had the most voters in the college district.

The contest turned out to be a cliffhanger.

I won in Clarenceville by 22 votes, in Garden City by 69 votes, and in Plymouth by 735 votes. Until results came in from Livonia, I was leading the race by 826 votes. But when Livonia reported 3,507 votes for Raymond, to 2,535 for me, Raymond was ahead by 146 votes with only Northville to be heard from.

The tallies were slow coming from Northville. Election officials reported

that more than 100 still were in line when the polls officially closed at 8 p.m. Finally, at 10:15 p.m., almost two hours after the machine precincts in other districts had reported, the Northville figures came in.

The tally was 617 for me, 192 for Mrs. Raymond. I had won the race by a bare margin of 279 votes from a total of 10,207 cast. The districtwide count was 5,243 to 4,964. It is my belief that the wide margin I received from Northville voters was due to the endorsement of Bill Sliger's Northville Record and the support of Dr. Gordon Forrer, who then represented Northville on the college board.

During the election, James Boswell won the right to represent Livonia on

the college board in a close race with Simon Bienenfeld.

Rosina Raymond might easily have been discouraged. She had lost in the elections of 1961 and 1965. At that point, many a person would have given up trying. But Rosina didn't, and her tenacity paid off. She ran again in 1971, was elected to the board, and still serving as a trustee as this is written, establishing an unmatched record for tenure as a board member at Schoolcraft. Jane Moehle, Paul Mutnick and Clarke Oldenburg come next, each having served on the board for 10 years (1961-71).

IN AUGUST 1965 the boards of education of Redford Union and South

Redford made another attempt to get their communities to join the Schoolcraft College district.

This third and final try was prompted by the announcement that both of the Redfords were to be automatically lumped with the new Wayne County Community College district, then in the formative stage.

Residents of the Redfords began to opt for Schoolcraft when it became apparent that the facilities being planned for the new college were not only farther away from the Redfords, but would not become available until 1970.

But the Redfords acted too late. The Schoolcraft board of trustees approved the Redford petitions and forwarded them to the State Board of Public Community and Junior Colleges, but the state ruled that the Redfords already were part of the Wayne County Community College district and could not transfer.

One is led to wonder whether Jack Edwards MacGriff and other Redford citizens, who vigorously opposed the

continued efforts of their educators to have the two communities join Schoolcraft, have ever had any second thoughts about the stance they took in 1961 and 1962.

MEANTIME, enrollment at Schoolcraft College continued to mount.

When the institution began its second year, in the fall of 1965, about 3,000 students applied, versus 2,425 during the first year. The faculty now numbered 72.

In September it was announced that Jon P. Adams, regional representative for vocational and technical education for the U.S. Department of Education, had been appointed dean of technical instruction at the college, replacing James Dotseth, who resigned in July to accept a position at Oakland Community College. Before taking the post with the federal government, Adams had served eight years as a dean at Ferris Institute.

## Schoolcraft and Livonia locked horns on freeway

Should the proposed I-275 freeway be routed east or west of the Schoolcraft College campus?

That question led to a controversy early in 1966 which involved the college, the city of Livonia and the Michigan State Highway Department.

The first inkling that there might be a dispute over a three-mile section of the route the freeway was to take had come in November 1964.

That was when Mayor Harvey Moelke and the City Council of Livonia first took exception to the State Highway Department's proposal to route the new highway through college property, east of the campus.

Taking the position that the eastern

route would "isolate the college campus from the rest of Livonia," the mayor and the council argued that the freeway should go along Haggerty Road, west of the college.

THE MATTER remained dormant until early 1966 when the State Highway Department began pressing for a decision.

"Failure to reach agreement on routing of the stretch between Schoolcraft and Eight Mile is the only thing blocking completion of I-275," Henrik E. Stafseth, deputy state highway director, told a Detroit News reporter.

At the outset, the highway department had three possible routes in mind. One ran between Eckles and Haggerty Roads, along the eastern side of the

college campus. The department began to back away from that plan when Moelke and the Livonia City Council raised objections, saying that there were plans for a subdivision for homes in the \$40,000 to \$50,000 class that would be disrupted if the highway went there. Besides, Livonia, said, it would leave a triangle of land more or less cut off from the remainder of the city.

The second plan was to route the freeway through part of the property of the Northville State Hospital. This was declared infeasible because, as Tommy Thompson wrote in an editorial in the Observer newspapers, "Who ever heard of having a highly-travelled freeway run through land used for an institution for the mentally disturbed?"

That left the third plan, which would

run the expressway along Haggerty Road within 80 feet of the front door of the college administration building. It would slice a big portion off the front side of the institution, eliminate the faculty parking lot and take about a third of the student lot.

The college trustees didn't have to think twice before giving that plan a unanimous "no." College trustees were as adamant against plan three as the city of Livonia was against plan one.

Trustees remembered that the State Highway Department had asked that the college be built as close to Haggerty Road as possible because the freeway was scheduled to come across the eastern side of the campus. Running the highway along Haggerty would make the college face backwards and

completely upset the campus master plan.

At the regular meeting on Jan. 5, 1966, trustees listened to Howard Hill, director of the Michigan State Highway Department, discuss the three possible routes.

Although the college board firmly rejected the first plan, it told Hill it would listen to any other suggestion the highway department might come up with.

SOME OF THE trustees thought the college was being let down by the Livonia officials.

"Had we been aware that the city wouldn't consider the easterly route," Jane Moehle told the Plymouth Observer, "we would have changed the com-

plex of the campus prior to construction."

Harold Fischer agreed. "It appears to us," he said, "that the city of Livonia likes Schoolcraft College when it is to its advantage, but we are just part of a five-member college district when it is to its disadvantage."

The highway department, which originally preferred the eastern route, pointed out that the city-preferred route along Haggerty would cost \$12.7 million to build as opposed to \$6.3 million for the college-preferred route.

Schoolcraft's business manager, Ken Lindner, presented figures to show that the Haggerty Road route would cost the college a total of \$619,000 for necessary changes plus another \$100,000 for additional land acquisition.

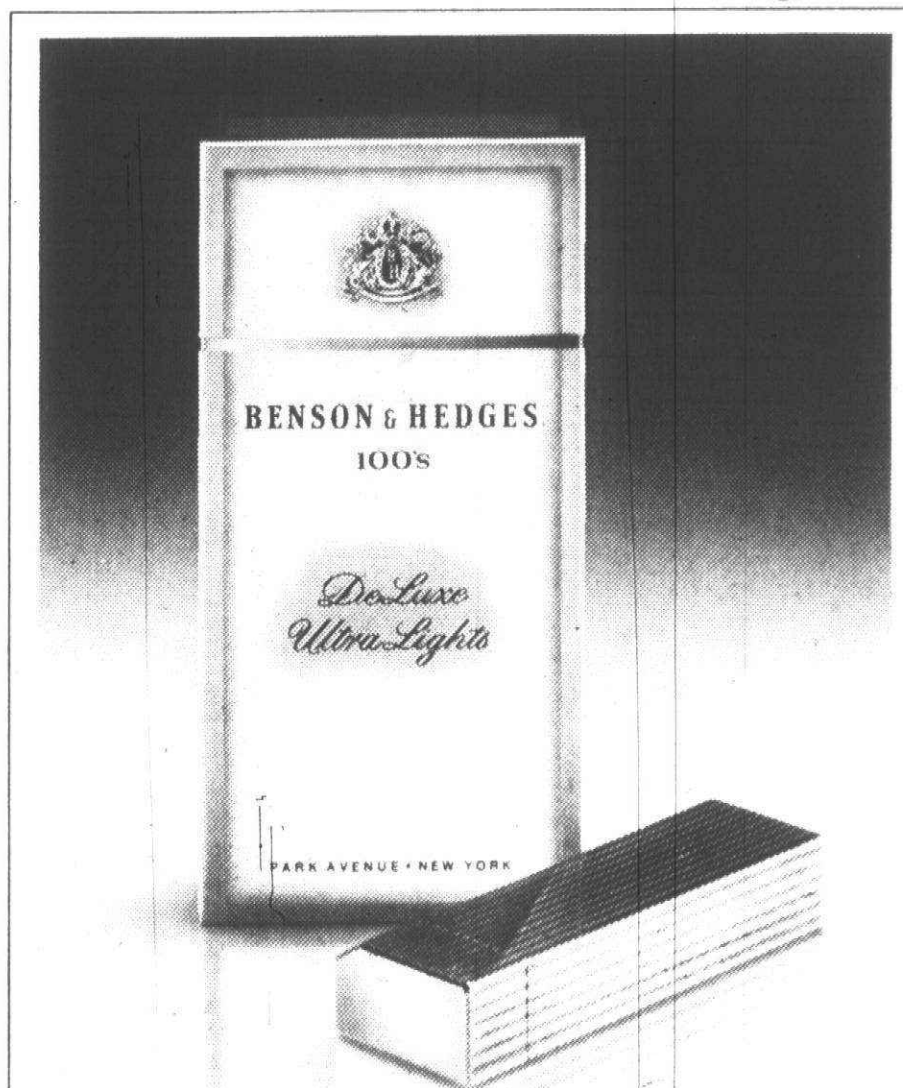

## 7 are among Merit semifinalists

Seven students at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP) are among the semifinalists in the national Merit Scholarships competition.

Semifinalists from Plymouth Salem High School include: Mike VanDyke, 17; Mike McLennen, 14; Harold Hansen, 17; Pam Grimm, 17; and Gus Grannan, 17.

Semifinalists from Plymouth Canton High School include Ming Kuan Hsieh, 16, and Jim Drouillard, 17.

The seven are among about 15,000 semifinalists nationwide in competition for some 5,000 Merit Scholarships to be awarded in the spring of 1983.

The seniors represent the top half of 1 percent of each state's high school senior class.

More than one million students attending some 18,000 secondary schools in the U.S. entered the competition by taking qualifying exams in 1981 when most were juniors.

About 90 percent of the semifinalists are expected to qualify as finalists. At least 1,500 of the 5,000 Merit Scholarships to be offered in 1983 will be one-

time National Merit \$1,000 scholarships.

A majority of the \$1,000 awards will be underwritten by corporate and business sponsors who also finance four-year scholarships.

Some 3,500 renewable Merit Scholarships worth between \$1,000 and \$8,000 over each winner's four-year undergraduate study will be awarded in 1983. Of these some 1,500 will be funded by corporations, company foundations and businesses which designate the awards for children of employees for specific geographic areas or for special careers.

More than 2,000 renewable scholarships from \$1,000 to \$8,000 for four years will be sponsored by 180 colleges and universities.

In April and early May names of the 1983 Merit Scholars will be released.

Since 1956 more than 73,000 students have won Merit Scholarships valued at about \$210 million of whom some 18,800 are currently undergraduates in some 700 colleges and universities.



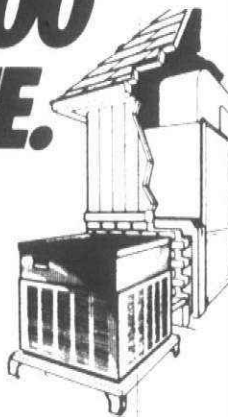

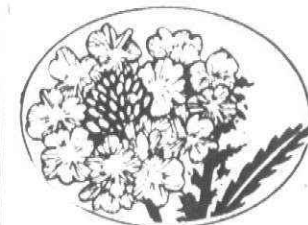

# Food, fuel, China are SC topics

Courses dealing with homegrown wood fuel, food processors, vegetarian diets and Chinese traditions are among those offered this fall at Schoolcraft College.

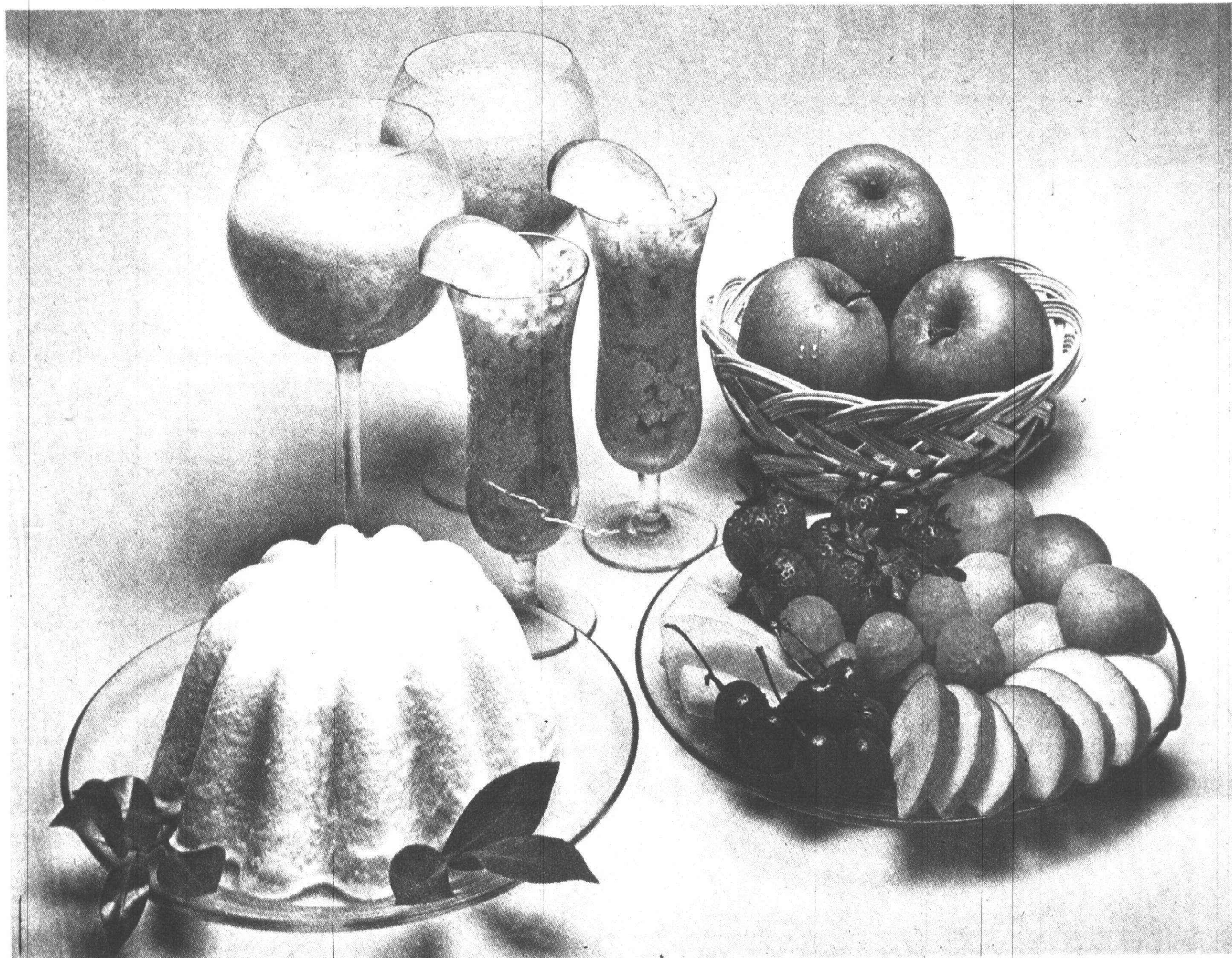

# Stay On The Light Side With Granny Smith!



Granny Smith is an unlikely name for an apple, and New Zealand might seem an unlikely place from which to ship apples to the United States. Mrs. Smith proudly sold apples from her tree at a local stand and they became known as "Granny Smith's cooking apple." Seeds were later taken to New Zealand and planted in the coastal lowlands

which have proven to be an ideal home for Granny Smith apples. The number of trees has more than quadrupled between 1953 and 1977 and they are now the leading variety exported from New Zealand.

The best thing is that they come to us during our summer season when we are looking for cool, crunchy and zesty ideas to spark summer meals.

Although the original Granny Smith got her reputation for her "cooking apples," this bright green apple is among the finest eating apples in the world. What could be better than a crisp cold apple for the kids when they come home, exclaiming, "What is there to eat?" If they are inclined to

eat just part of an apple at a time, cut some Grannies in wedges, dip them in lemon juice and water to keep them from darkening and put them in a covered dish in the refrigerator. No waste, and a really juicy, nutritious snack.

Such old adages as "an apple a day keeps the doctor away" and "nature's toothbrush" are being confirmed by current research. Apples contain a lot of cellulose. Cellulose supplies our bodies with bulk, which we are finding out is such an important part of our diets. To stay on the light side, here are some exciting, easy and different ways to get your apple a day, along with other beautiful fruits of summer. If you want to look great in those swimming suits, and keep the sparkle in your eyes as well, be sure to include plenty of fresh fruits in your summer diet.

## Summer Fruit Supreme

Cherries Watermelon balls  
Strawberries Apricots  
Papayas Granny Smith apples

Arrange on a chilled serving plate as finger food or a salad. If you are serving a dressing, remove the stems from the strawberries and remove the pits from the cherries. Serve with yogurt sweetened with just a bit of honey or with papaya seed dressing. You may use any combination of fruits in season, of course.

### Papaya Seed Dressing

1 cup white wine vinegar 2 cups salad oil  
1/2 cup sugar 1 small onion, minced  
1 teaspoon dry mustard 2 tablespoons fresh papaya seeds  
1 teaspoon seasoned salt

Place vinegar and dry ingredients in blender. Turn on and gradually add oil and onion. Blend until smooth. Add papaya seeds and blend only until they are cut to the size of coarsely ground pepper. Makes about 3 cups. Keeps well in refrigerator.

## Summer Surprises

Here are a few exotic suggestions you might want to surprise friends with.

Go to the drug store and get a plastic syringe and fill it with your favorite liqueur. Grand Marnier or Kirsch are both excellent. Inject the liqueur into strawberries and serve.

Cut fruit in bite size pieces, chill and put in sherbet glasses. Fill with champagne or your favorite wine.

Dip Granny Smith apple slices and fresh pineapple chunks in white creme de menthe for a real flavor surprise.

## Low Calorie Apple Freeze

Here is as elegant a low calorie dessert as you can imagine. Make it ahead and enjoy any time during the hot summer season.

4 tablespoons lemon juice  
2 teaspoons honey  
2 Granny Smith apples, cored and chopped but not peeled  
4 ice cubes  
1/4 teaspoon grated fresh ginger root  
2 teaspoons rum (optional)

Mix the lemon juice and honey. Place in blender with a few chopped apples. Blend well, adding more apples until all are blended. Add ice cubes, grated ginger and rum. Blend. Put in freezer until partially frozen, about half an hour. Stir and serve immediately in parfait or wine glasses.

To make ahead, freeze in a covered container. An hour before serving, remove from the freezer and place in refrigerator. Spoon into serving dishes. Serves 4... and only 60 calories per serving!

## Quick Energy Fruit Smoothie

1 Granny Smith apple 1 banana  
1 tablespoon lemon juice 1 fresh peach, seeded (peel if desired)  
2 cups orange juice 4 ice cubes

Peel, core and chop apple. Place in blender with 1 tablespoon lemon juice. Blend until smooth. Add orange juice, banana and peach, along with ice cubes. Blend for 1 minute. Makes 1 quart.

This super drink can be made with almost any fresh fruit in season, but don't forget the Grannies. They add that "something special" that will make your smoothies "something special."

## Granny Smith's Frozen Apple Mousse

3 Granny Smith apples 1 cup plain yogurt  
2 tablespoons lemon juice 1 egg white  
1 cup heavy cream, whipped 1/4 cup sugar

Peel and core apples and chop into small pieces. Place a few pieces at a time in blender with lemon juice and blend well. Add apple mixture to whipped cream. Fold in yogurt. Beat egg white to soft peak stage, add sugar slowly and continue beating. Fold egg white mixture into apple mixture. Spoon into a 4 cup mold and cover with plastic wrap. Freeze until firm, preferably overnight. To serve, remove from freezer 1 hour before serving and place in refrigerator. This will make it easier to cut into serving pieces. When ready to unmold, invert mold on serving plate. Dip towel in hot water and wring. Wrap towel around mold and hold until mold slips out. You may have to repeat with the hot towel. Serve immediately.

You may use unpeeled Grannies, too. The mousse will be a creamier color with a slightly different texture. Serves 6.

# Spirited chili

## TRIPLE CHILI

- 1 lb. lean ground beef
- 1 cut chopped onion
- 1 can (18 1/2 oz.) whole tomatoes, cut up
- 1 cup water
- 1/2 cup Triple Sec
- 2 Tbsp. tomato paste
- 2 Tbsp. white vinegar
- 3 Tbsp. chili powder
- 1 tsp. ground oregano
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. garlic salt
- 1/4 tsp. ground cumin or cumin seeds
- 1/4 - 1/2 tsp. hot pepper sauce
- 1 can (15 1/2 oz.) kidney beans
- Corn chips
- Sour cream, for garnish

Cook beef and onions in Dutch oven over medium high heat until meat is browned and onions are translucent. Drain. Add all other ingredients except last three. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, cover and simmer 25 minutes. Add kidney beans the last five minutes, or heat and serve along with cooked white rice as side dishes if desired. Serve the chili in bowls lined with corn chips. Top with dollop of sour cream. Makes five servings.

# Try plum kuchen

"Plum" means "something excellent or superior" or "something given as recompense." Either definition is appropriate for that delicious fruit, the plum.

Michigan growers specialize in Italian prune plums, primarily the Stanley and Blufre varieties. Both are excellent for canning and freezing, and of course for fresh use.

Here's a recipe for Plum Kuchen for the Michigan Plum Advisory board, in which you can use fresh plums now, substitute canned plums this winter.

Wash two pounds fresh plums, barely cover with water in a heavy saucepan, and simmer just until tender. Set aside to cool, remove pits.

Combine and beat until light, 1/4 cup butter and 3/4 cup sugar. Add 1 egg and mix well. Sift together 1 1/2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 teaspoon salt. Add to creamed mixture alternately with 1/2 cup milk. Pour into greased 1 1/2-quart baking dish. Arrange pitted plums on top. Pour 1/4 cup of the plum juice over, then sprinkle with a combination of 1/4 cup sugar and 1 teaspoon of cinnamon. Bake at 375° about 30 minutes. Serve warm. Pass a bowl of thick sweet cream.

# Salem fullbacks rumble past outmanned Canton

Plymouth Salem coach Tom Moshimer smiled broadly. "Scotty Jurek got that many?" he asked, still beaming.

Moshimer had a right to smile. Last week his Rocks had to rely on an unfamiliar weapon — the forward pass — to beat North Farmington.

Friday things returned to normal for Salem, as the Rock fullbacks blasted through an outmanned Plymouth Canton defense to ignite an 18-6 triumph on a rain-soaked CEP field.

Moshimer's offense revolves around the option, run out of the wishbone offense. The key play, as the Salem coach will freely admit, is the quarterback's first option: whether or not he hands off to the fullback up the middle.

Against Canton, Rock quarterbacks Pete Steyaert and Dave Haut handed it

off to the fullback — again and again and again.

The result was an astounding 310 yards rushing by the two Salem fullbacks. Jurek, a 6-1, 200-pound junior, rumbled for 202 yards on 28 carries and Jim Sinclair, a 6-0, 195-pound senior, pounded out 108 yards on 13 tries.

"THEY (CANTON) WERE taking away our outside game and giving us the fullback," Moshimer explained. "As long as the fullback's going good, we're going to run them."

Running well they were. The first time the Rocks had the ball they traveled 70 yards for a touchdown. Halfbacks Mickey Madsen and Jeff Arnold gained the first five yards of the drive before Jurek and Sinclair took over.

Jurek carried six consecutive times, gaining 8, 4, 23, 7, 4 and 5 yards to put the ball at the Canton 15. Sinclair then took over, lugging the ball twice, the final carry going eight yards for the

touchdown. Madsen's extra point kick was blocked, making it 6-0 Salem.

THE SCORE REMAINED tied for exactly 1:41. After two Canton run plays gained six yards, quarterback Pat Murphy fired a strike to end Bob Wasczenski, who one-handed the ball and raced 59 yards into the end zone. Matt Santilli's extra point kick failed, leaving the score tied at 6-6.

That play didn't sit well with Moshimer. The Canton player he was most concerned with coming into the game was Wasczenski, the 6-3, 205-pound junior tight end. "We didn't do a very good job of holding him up at the line," the Salem coach said of the Canton TD play.

The rain started coming down harder after the Chiefs score, and play degenerated with the weather conditions. A 10-play, 48-yard drive midway through the second quarter gave Salem the lead for good, as Sinclair scored his second touchdown from two yards out.

AGAIN, IT WAS the fullbacks that carried the load in the drive, gaining 27 of the 48 yards. A two-point pass attempt failed and Salem had a 12-6 advantage.

A Santilli reverse got Canton going on its next possession, gaining 23 yards. But two plays later, Sinclair picked off a Murphy pass and Salem had the ball again, at its own 41.

Five Jurek runs and a personal foul penalty against the Chiefs got Salem the touchdown, with Jurek going the final yard for the score with just 26 seconds remaining in the half. Again, the extra point pass failed, and it was 18-6.

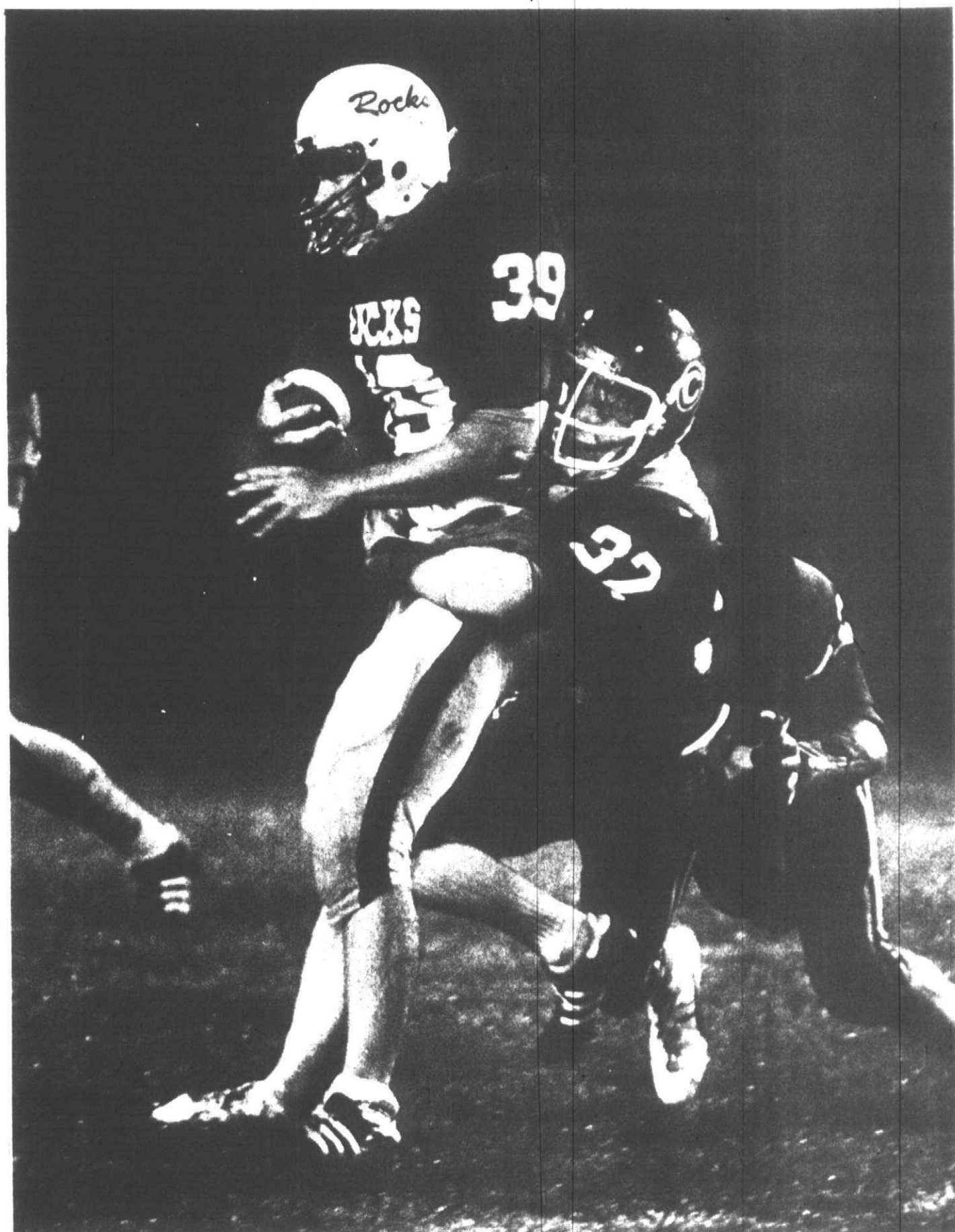
Jurek rolled up 161 yards by half-time and Sinclair had 64 yards. "We made a change at the half," Canton coach Rich Barr said, "and I thought we shut it down a bit."

Indeed, the Salem fullbacks weren't quite as effective in the second half, but the damage had been done. What the Chiefs needed were a few breaks. They got them, but failed to cash in.

SALEM DROVE to the Canton four on the last play of the third quarter. But the slippery conditions caused a bobble in the backfield on the next play and quarterback Steyaert lost the handle.

Wasczenski alertly scooped up the ball and was off to the races. The Canton end clearly had this sprint won, as he sped toward his goal line 10 yards ahead of the nearest Salem player.

But there was a problem in the pack behind him. Someone shoved a Salem player from behind, an unnecessary

clip that nullified the touchdown and brought the ball all the way back into Canton's end of the field.

"If the TD by Wasc had counted," Barr said wishfully. Then he added, "But it didn't."

"I'M SAD WE didn't win, but not unhappy. The defense never gave up, I've got to give them credit. And we moved the ball better this week than last."

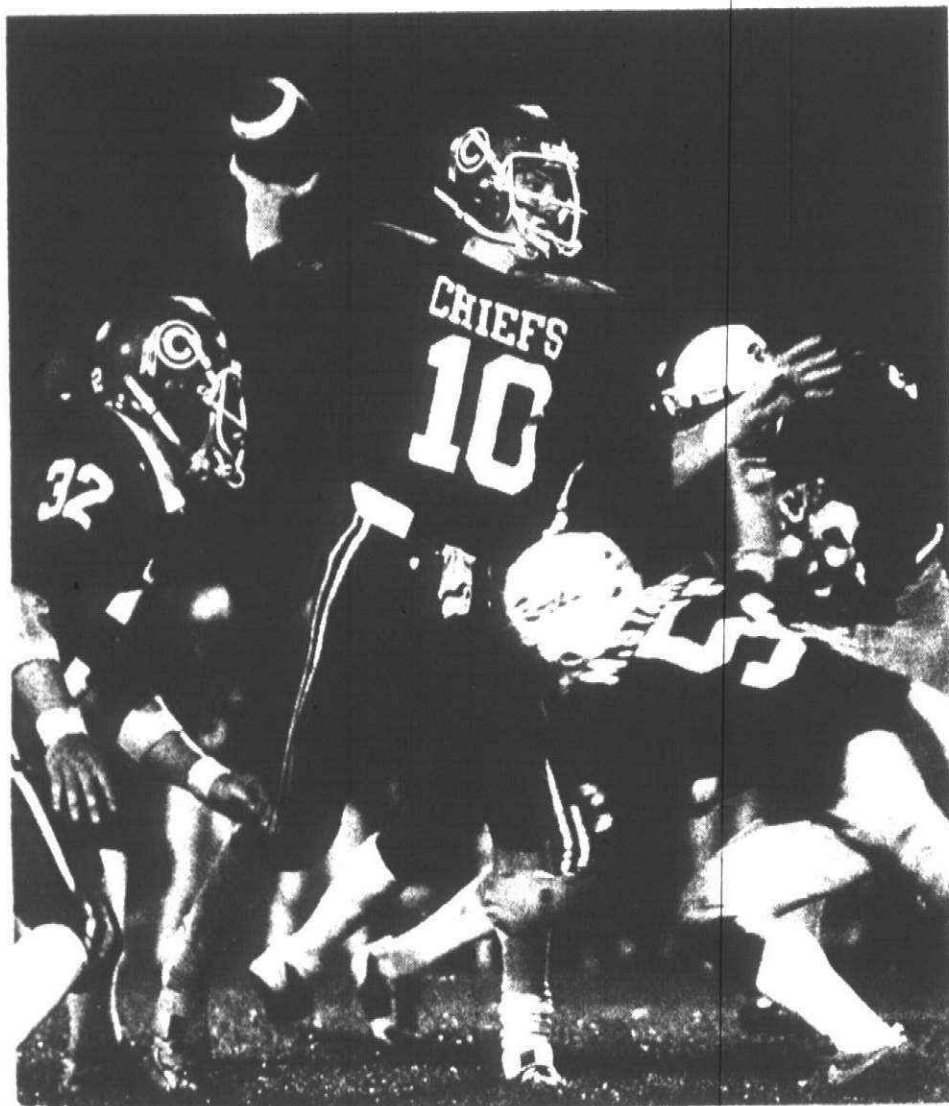
Murphy finished with four completions in nine passes for 121 yards and a touchdown, his third in two games. But he was intercepted twice. Santilli was Canton's leading rushing with 34 yards on just three tries.

Even the Salem fumbles — two inside the Canton 5-yard line — didn't bother Moshimer. "It was just the weather, a wet ball," the winning coach, standing on the rain-drenched

field, said after the game. "Both teams played well."

A familiar face approached, a former assistant coach of Moshimer's — Canton coach Barr.

"I'm waiting for you," Barr said to his former boss. "When you lose, no one walks back with you to the locker room. So I thought I'd walk back with you — maybe something will rub off." Whatever it is, it can't hurt.

## Chiefs even record; Rocks stay unbeaten

Experience, talent and defense — three key ingredients if a girls' basketball team is to dominate.

Plymouth Canton's female cagers are not dominant. Not yet. But the Chiefs are improving in all three of those very important categories.

Canton evened its record at 2-2 Thursday by blasting hapless Farmington, 58-33, at Farmington. The Chiefs were in control all the way, leading by five after one quarter (14-9), 13 at the half (30-17) and 18 after three quarters (42-24).

One very good reason they were able to maintain such control was the play of 5-10 senior center Missy Aiken. Chief coach Phyllis Cunningham called Aiken's 23-point, 18-rebound performance "awesome — she dominated the boards."

BUT IT WAS a team effort that helped Canton to its 25-point victory, its second straight after losses to Plymouth Salem and Walled Lake Central. But the Chiefs' wins (they beat Northville, 59-20, Tuesday) came against two of the weaker teams in the Western Lakes Activities Association (WLAA).

Still, a win is a win, and Cunningham was pleased with the team's progress.

"They were consistent and played good defense," the first-year Canton coach said. "Each game I see improvement in our defense and that apprehensive feeling young ballplayers have diminishes."

"We're pretty balanced down the bench, and that will help us down the line."

That "apprehensive feeling" is more commonly known as inexperience, and that was the biggest problem facing Cunningham when she took over the reigns this year from Mike McCauley. The question for Canton now is, just how fast can they gain that valuable commodity — experience?

CUNNINGHAM FEELS the key is the defense. "If they play good defense, they won't be afraid to put the ball up," she said. "Confidence in defense generates the offense."

Sue Gerke added eight points to the Chief attack, with Lou Ann Hamblin scoring seven. Mary Ann Kuhnlein topped Farmington with 10 points.

Canton gathered 51 team rebounds, another promising statistic. Still, the tougher competition lies ahead in the schedule, and it will take an experienced team to handle the Salems and Livonia Bentleys.

"A pressure situation is a tough situation," Cunningham said. "But they're finding out they can perform positively under pressure."

For Cunningham, the challenge is to keep the Chiefs on the right track, now that they're on it.

### SALEM 54 WL WESTERN 43

In a battle of unbeaten teams, Plymouth Salem thoroughly dominated a taller Walled Lake Western team in winning its fourth straight game Thursday at Salem.

The final margin was 11 points, but the Rocks' advantage grew to 18 in the fourth quarter. The main contributing factor to the easy triumph was the same as in the three earlier victories: defense.

"(Ann) Glomski fouled out but played a super defensive game," coach Bob Blohm said. "She and Pam McBride did a good job shutting off their big people inside."

Being outsized is nothing new to the Rocks. But Western's advantage was awesome: McBride, a 5-6 junior, had the defensive responsibility of covering the Warriors' 6-3 sophomore center, Val Hall. Carol Croll, a 6-0 forward, was defended by Glomski, who stands 4 meters 5-4.

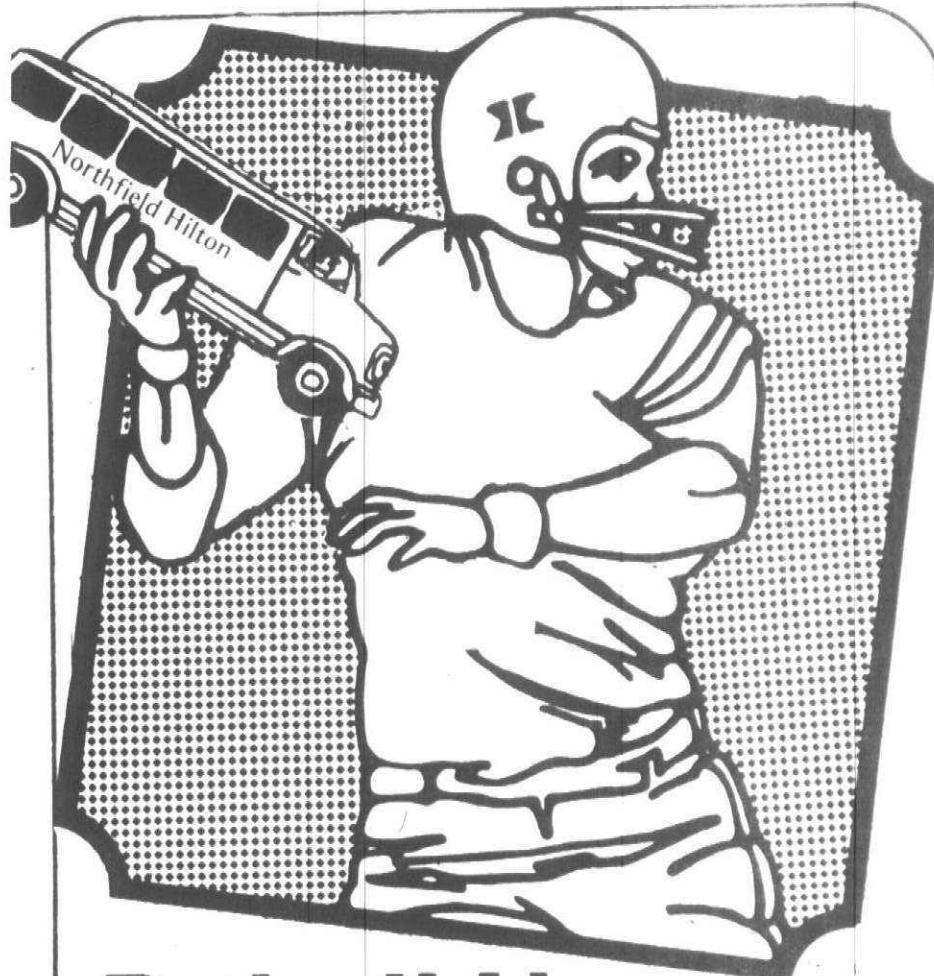

# MHSAA lawsuit survives a 1st-round challenge

It took more than talent for sophomore Leif Sell to play for Detroit Country Day in its varsity football game against archrival Cranbrook Friday afternoon. It took a last-minute temporary restraining order in Oakland County Circuit Court.

Judge Fred Mester granted the request for the restraining order in a nick-of-time decision that allowed Sell to play football after he had missed the opening-game win against Orchard Lake St. Mary.

Sell is a transfer student from Clawson and the rules of the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) state that an athlete must sit out one semester of competition after transferring from one school to another.

The rule is designed to prevent schools from raiding star athletes at other schools. Sell has never lettered in high school and went to Country Day

for its hockey program. He is also ineligible for hockey according to MHSAA rules.

**THE INJUNCTION** was granted in a suit brought against the MHSAA by Troy city councilman Peter Taucher, who alleges that the MHSAA's powers in controlling high school athletic competition in the state are illegal and arbitrary.

The hearing was delayed for 10 days Friday and will resume Monday, Sept. 27. The injunction also covered two Waterford Mott students, whose attorneys have joined Taucher in his suit against the MHSAA.

Junior Tony Brattin of Waterford Mott was allowed to play football Friday night, and sophomore basketball player Stacey Lomerson will practice and play in games during the next 10 days.

Lomerson's attorney, Al Holtz, was retained by the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) following a letter

written to the ACLU by her father, Roger. He was laid off and could no longer afford to send his daughter to Our Lady of Lakes, a parochial school. Stacey was a junior varsity basketball player at Our Lady last year.

**THE DELAY** in the trial became necessary after motions to make Country Day and the Waterford School District defendants in the suit along with the MHSAA. Country Day is a willing defendant and will testify that it does not obey the MHSAA voluntarily, but must do so if it wishes to engage in interscholastic athletics.

Michigan Attorney General Frank Kelley ruled in an advisory opinion in 1977 that the MHSAA may set guidelines, but that compliance with rules must be at a local level and must be voluntary.

The MHSAA and its attorney, Edmund Sikorski, will argue that Country Day and other schools belong to the association voluntarily.

Once the ACLU had entered the case and motions were granted bringing Country Day and the Waterford School District into the case, and Judge Mester had announced plans for a 10-day delay, Friday's session became a warmup with both sides outlining their positions.

At issue was whether to grant the temporary restraining order permitting the three athletes to play during the 10-day recess.

Though Judge Mester granted the request for the restraining order, he made it clear he has yet to be overly impressed with arguments against the MHSAA.

"You people have a long road to go to have this court determine that the MHSAA rules are improperly enforced," he warned the plaintiffs' attorneys after granting their request for the restraining order.

Mester also said he had "concern

over the plaintiffs' (ability) to sustain themselves at the ultimate hearing."

**TAUCHER**, HIS co-counsel Thomas Plunkett, the ACLU and McMillan will argue that the transfer rule is arbitrary. It affects girls basketball and football, for example, but not track or baseball. A star athlete in baseball may be recruited by another school, sit out the fall semester and play his sport in the spring.

They will also argue that the MHSAA can't restrict the length of seasons or the distance a team can travel to a tournament or game. Under current MHSAA rules, for example, a team could travel 1,000 miles to the farthest reaches of Ontario, but couldn't travel to Boston.

Last year, Chuck Schmidt, the Country Day athletic director, petitioned the MHSAA to allow his hockey team to go to a tournament in Boston. The MHSAA refused and Country Day reluctantly stayed home.

Though Country Day is officially a defendant in the suit, Schmidt, who was in court for the entire hearing, congratulated Taucher warmly after the restraining order was granted.

"We're not trying to destroy the MHSAA," said Taucher after the suit. "We just want enforcement of the rules back where it belongs (at a school board level)."

In a related development in Wayne County, an injunction was granted Tuesday allowing Mike Morris, a transfer to Livonia from Catholic Central, to play golf. His father, Ken, is a lawyer and was in the Oakland courtroom Friday.

"It's obvious this is going to the Court of Appeals," he said. "I'm going to join with Taucher on the appeal. These issues have never been argued there. If we win (here), I know they (the MHSAA) will appeal, and if they win, I know I am going to appeal."

## End of summer brings the worst in film releases

For some people, the end of summer is a wonderful time. Mothers breathe a sign of relief as their youngsters go back to school. Nature lovers anticipate the fall colors and the crisp air. Sports enthusiasts look forward to the gridiron clashes that will testify to the brilliance or stupidity of the preceding draft.

But for a movie critic, the end of summer is the pits. It's the scrapings and leavings and leftovers as theaters offer a choice of product that generally ranges from dumb to disgusting.

Consequently, we have such movie fare as "Zapped," "The Concrete Jungle," "The Soldier" and, perhaps the most revolting of all, "Pink Floyd the Wall" (R).

**THE MOVIE**, with music by Roger Waters, presents a visual interpretation of the rock group Pink Floyd's best-selling album "The Wall." It stars Bob Geldorf as the hallucinating rock 'n' roll performer Pink.

As described by the director, Alan Parker, Pink "sits locked in a hotel room, somewhere in Los Angeles. Too many shows, too much dope, too much applause; a burned-out case . . . We shuffle time and place, reality and nightmare as we venture into Pink's painful memories, each one a 'brick' in the wall he has gradually built around his feelings."

What follows is a series of hellish sequences — rape, riot, decaying flesh — all accompanied by loud acid rock. In his dope-induced fantasies, Pink becomes a Hitler-type demagogue wielding power over unthinking masses. He identifies with Christ and sees himself as Jesus, not with his Apostles or on the Cross but bleeding in a Hollywood swimming pool.

Who needs this? Who needs the excesses and the repugnant images of this movie with its obvious hatred of women and its dark apocalyptic visions? Even so, the tone is self-pity. Pity poor Pink because his father died in World War II at about the time when Pink was born.

Pink goes to school (to the sounds of "We don't need no education") but only finds thought control instead of stimulation. He is exposed to teachers who, according to the press notes, "castise and surpress" (sic) him. This leads me to suspect that he may have been exposed to education, but he didn't catch any.

**WHEN PINK BECOMES** a rock 'n' roll performer he suffers from the pressures of popularity. What can we expect of him after such a hard life except that he should become an addict, stick his hand in the toilet and build a wall around himself?

Well, you get the drift, the general flush of Pink's hallucinations. Decidedly unpleasant. Better, I think, to stick with the album, if you like that kind of music. However, if you like that kind of music, maybe you would like the movie.

I don't know. I spent too many years in school having my mind "surpressed" with ideas.

**DIVA (R).** New wave film from France is a comedy, a thriller and a romance. Written by Jean-Jacques Beineix, directed by Philippe Russet.

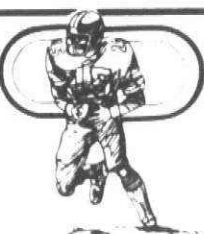
