A TREE grows in Canton Make that 270 trees will grow in

Township trustees voted Tuesday to plant 270 assorted trees in the township late this fall during the 1984 Tree Planting Program.

Crimboli Landscaping of Canton has been awarded the bid at \$39 for each tree, the same price as last year. Aaron Machnick, chief building official, said 225 of the trees will be planted in front of homes, 25 in the park and the remainder used to replace dead or dying trees along Sheldon Road

TEN ACRES of land adjacent to the Fellows Creek Golf Course has been purchased by the township to expand the

According to Mike Gouin. superintendent of parks and recreation, the additional land will make the course more challenging. Gouin said the course will be lengthened, and space added between holes.

Gouin said no taxpayers revenues have been spent on the course and that the revenues have covered all costs of acquistion and operation.

# Closing looms for nursing home

A pall of fear, anger and disbelief clouds the cinderblock halls and rooms of Dion Memorial Nursing Home, ordered to close Oct. 26 by Ingham County Circuit Court Judge L. Thomas Brown.

Judge Brown ordered the opera tors of the nursing home at 43825 Michigan to "cease operation . . . and cooperate with all appropriate agencies and or relatives of the patients to (ensure) the proper placement of all patients in the facility' late last month

The fate of Dion, its staffers and

85 sick and elderly residents has been in doubt since 1980 when its license renewal was denied due to repeated health care violations. A recently submitted state Department of Public Health report says the home "violated the residents' per-sonal dignity," according to Ron Styka, assistant attorney general.

Dion personnel claim several improvements have been made, and that the home provides quality care

and should remain open.
From makeshift headquarters in the Dion nursing director's office, workers from the Department of Social Services assessed patients and broke the news to them last week.

## what's inside State considers prison purchase

By Gary M. Cates

The Detroit House of Correction (Deboco) on Five Mile in Plymouth Township could become a medium-security state prison.

"We are very interested in the possi-ble purchase of Dehoco," said Gail Light, a Department of Corrections

But state Rep. Gerald Law, R-Plymouth Township whose district includes part of Canton, vows to fight any proposal by the state to use the facility as a prison.

"I'm not going to have the Plymouth-Northville area be the correctional center for the City of Detroit," Law

Dehoco is owned and operated by the City of Detroit and houses prisoners serving up to one-year sentences. Detroit wants to close the facility and is negotiating with Wayne County for the transfer of prisoners.

There should be some movement of prisoners out of Dehoco within the next 30 days," said Mike Conway, a spokesman for County Executive William Lu-

Without the recent construction of a county jail in downtown Detroit, such a move wouldn't have been possible. Be-





# Proposal C: What majority rules on taxes?

N ONE point both sides agree: If Proposal "Voter's Choice," as it's called - is adopted Nov. 6, it will result in a massive shift of taxing power away from the Michigan Legislature and local governing boards to

The agreement ends there. Richard Headlee favors C. "If the government must live on less money, or if the taxpayer must live on less money, who should make that decision?" said the 1982 Republican gubernatorial nomnee who is president of Alexander Hamilton Life Insurance Co. "In light of current high tax rates, we

know what government's decision would be." Robert Bowman is against it. "Without the tax increase," said the state treasurer of the events of 1983, "in eight weeks we wouldn't have had enough cash to meet a payroll. The last payless payday we had was in 1959, and we still heard about it on Wall Street a generation later."



## Proposal C's many effects

The so-called "Voter's Choice" proposal, if approved by voters Nov. 6, would amend the Michigan Constitution and laws in these ways:

1. Require a referendum vote on all future state and local tax increases. and all tax increases since Dec. 31.

"It's a shot at local government," said Bowman. discounting Headlee's appeal for direct democracy on taxes. "Property tax (voter) turnouts are the worst turnouts in the state . . . The only one worse is a recall."

Bowman said the section rolling back cities' income taxes on commuters would cost them \$40 million annually. Headlee said the lost revenue could be made up

by cost savings: "First, eliminate the Detroit transt system and merge it with SEMTA (Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority). Second, merge Detroit and Highland Park. It would change the environment for business "We've taken the wrong course to help Detroit,"

said Headlee, advocating low-tax "enterprise zones" in areas of high unemployment. The idea has been advanced by U.S. Rep. Jack Kemp, R-N.Y., and embraced by President Ronald Reagan.

BUT BOWMAN argued that business, commerce and tourism would be adversely affected by C. citing the road rebuilding program that began after gasoline and weight taxes were raised in 1982. 'Roads are arteries of commerce and tourism,'

the state treasurer said. "From 1970 to 1980, we let our roads and bridges decay faster than we repaired them. That four-cents-a gallon gasoline tax rollback would cost \$260 million. 'And here's the hooker: We would lose another \$310 million in federal matching money. Altogether

we stand to lose a total of nearly \$600 million." Bowman later produced a statement from state ransportation Director James P. Pitz saying Proposal C would stop "Michigan's transportation revival dead in its tracks. Except for projects already under way, we would simply have no highway im-

provement program in 1985. Eliminated from the 1985 schedule if C is passed, Pitz said, are: • Reconstruction of the Lodge freeway (US-10).

 Upgrading Dixie Highway (US-10) in Oakland Upgrading a section of Woodward in Oakland

• Upgrading Telegraph Road (US-24) south of Plymouth Road in Wayne County.

• Widening Ford Road (M-153) in western

state legislators adopted a new health code. FRUSTRATING the DSS is the fact that "As of August 1984, a rough raw count showed less than a percent vacancy rate at nursing homes in Wayne County," said Fox. "Out of the 10,000 - 11,000 beds in Wayne County, only 74 are vacant."

Paul Phelps, director of licensing and certification for the state health department, said he has 'no knowledge of" a vacancy problem.

be enforced at all," said Cook. The facility believes it has complied with all of the regulations of the Department of Public Health in a reasonable way, and continues to comply with all requests. I don't feel that under the circumstances that either the patients or the facility itself should be jeopardized by a closure.

"We do believe that if (it's) necessary (to appeal), the court will agree with that position," added

According to Phelps, whether the home actually closes "is up to the facility." If deficiencies are corrected, it could remain open, he said. However, he added, "there were more deficiencies noted last August than in 1975 when we issued the intent to deny the (license renewal.)"

Among the many violations cited in August were: patients left in their own urine and feces for extended periods of time;

# Good advice: 'Use thou honey for it is good'

looked upon simply as a "healthful almajor sweetener for approximately 10,000 years, until sugar (known only since the 13th-century AD) finally stole the spotlight only a couple of hundred

Prehistoric man gathered honey, as is evidenced by cave paintings found near Valencia, Spain, depicting a wild bees' hive located on a cliffside being tapped by an intrepid climber.

Honey was enjoyed throughout antiquity, and was enumerated in the Bible as one of "the principle things necessary for the life of man," along with water, fire, fron, salt, milk, bread of flour, the clusters of the grape, oil and

THE LEGENDARY goodness of honey is reflected in a myriad of Biblical quotations, ranging from a refer ence to the "land rich and broad, where milk and honey, flow," which was promised to the Israelites, to the wise King Solomon's advice to his son: "Use

thou honey for it is good." The Egyptians, too, appreciated hontemple, dating from the third millenium BC, depict methods of beekeeping, a science founded early in the history of civilized man.

In fact, the bee and its product, honey, were so important to the Egyptians that one symbol of royalty in ancient Egypt was the honeybee (a symbol pted many centuries later by Napoeon for his insignia)

WHAT WAS GOOD for the Egyptians was good for the Greeks, who were particularly fond of honey, espe cially the wild honey from Mount Hythyme flowers.

Similarly, what was nectar to the Greeks was ambrosia to the Romans, who formalized the art of beekeeping into a science.

Nessen threw three straight incompletions and the Vikings were down to their last play. They cashed in, however, as Nessen hit Curt Calhoun for 17 yards. From there, the Vikings marched in, Mike VanSicklen scoring his fourth TD of the second half, from 2 yards out.

Nessen then hit Tom Farr for the two-point conversion and with 59 seconds left Salem trailed, for the first

time in the game, 35-28.

But, the Rocks had a bit of the heroic left in them. In 53 seconds, the Rocks managed to march 71 yards in seven plays to score.

With three seconds left, quarterback Steve Sobditch hit Craig Morton on an unbelievable 31-yard TD strike. Mark Dixon added the extra point to send the game into overtime.

The laughter ended quickly. Nessen scored on the first play and the Rocks failed to score in their four plays.

It was the second overtime loss of the season for Salem.

"I really don't know," said Salem coach Tom Moshimer afterward. "I can't explain it. It was an up and down game. We couldn't stop them, and they couldn't stop us. We had op-portunities. We had them stopped in

IT APPEARED Salem may have taken the wind out of Central's sails with its third score of the half. The Rocks got the ball on their 49 with just 37 seconds left before halftime. Sobditch hit Steve Potoczak for 21 yards. He then hit back Brian Tiller on a flair pattern. Tiller turned it into a 30-yard score with his speed and a three-yard leap across the goal line.

But, the second half belonged to the Vikings. They outscored Salem 35-14 and outgained them 291-187 in total

The Vikings tied the game just seven minutes into the third quarter. VanSicklen scored on runs of 5 and 4






