A TREE grows in Canton. Make that 270 trees will grow in Canton.

Township trustees voted Tuesday to plant 270 assorted trees in the township late this fall during the 1984 Tree Planting Program.

Crimboli Landscaping of Canton has been awarded the bid at \$39 for each tree, the same price as last year. Aaron Machnick, chief building official, said 225 of the trees will be planted in front of homes, 25 in the park and the remainder used to replace dead or dying trees along Sheldon Road.

TEN ACRES of land adjacent to the Fellows Creek Golf Course has been purchased by the township to expand the course.

According to Mike Gouin, superintendent of parks and recreation, the additional land will make the course more challenging. Gouin said the course will be lengthened, and space added between holes.

Gouin said no taxpayers' revenues have been spent on the course and that the revenues have covered all costs of acquisition and operation.

OFFICER Sally Wright of the Wayne County sheriff's Metro Airport detail has been selected to join the K-9 unit of the department.

Wright has been sent to Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas, for 10 weeks of bomb detection training. She has been assigned a German shepherd named Nikon who will be used by the K-9 unit at the airport to sniff out bombs and narcotics.

Wright and her husband Tim Orbacki, a police officer with the airport department, and son Paul are Canton residents.

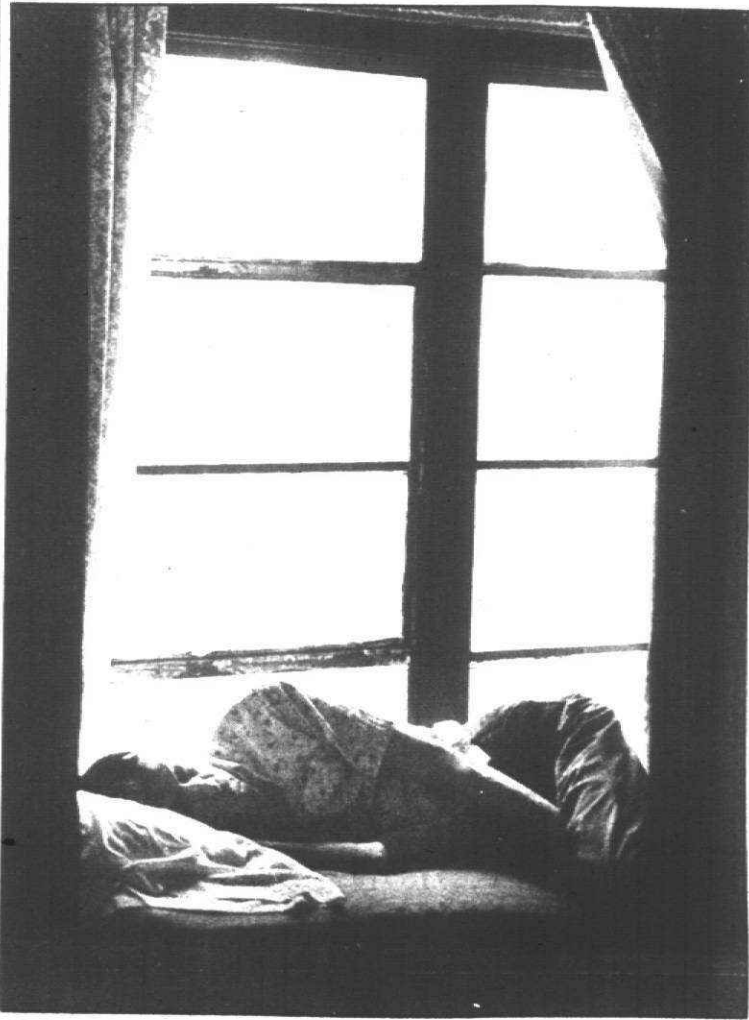

A pall of fear, anger and disbelief clouds the cinderblock halls and rooms of Dion Memorial Nursing Home, ordered to close Oct. 26 by Ingham County Circuit Court Judge L. Thomas Brown.

Judge Brown ordered the operators of the nursing home at 43825 Michigan to "cease operation . . . and cooperate with all appropriate agencies and or relatives of the patients to (ensure) the proper placement of all patients in the facility" late last month.

The fate of Dion, its staffers and

85 sick and elderly residents has been in doubt since 1980 when its license renewal was denied due to repeated health care violations. A recently submitted state Department of Public Health report says the home "violated the residents' personal dignity," according to Ron Styka, assistant attorney general.

Dion personnel claim several improvements have been made, and that the home provides quality care and should remain open.

From makeshift headquarters in the Dion nursing director's office, workers from the Department of Social Services assessed patients and broke the news to them last week.

Urban sprawl may have nixed sewer

The fear of urban sprawl may have played a part in the recent U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) decision to bypass grant funding for the massive Son of Supersewer project.

And the fear of urban sprawl may cause further cuts in the amount of federal funding the project will be eligible to receive.

The proposed \$120 million sewerage system faces cuts in grant funding levels because of new federal guidelines,

which could more than double local costs for some communities.

"Besides changing the maximum federal share from 75 to 55 percent, the new guidelines prohibit federal funding for projects which promote growth," said Richard Hinshon, director of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) community assistance division.

The additional 20 percent drop alone is expected to push costs to the local communities past \$23 million. The growth question could cause an additional 10 percent increase when and if

federal grants are made available, Hinshon said.

In September the EPA turned down a request by Wayne County to receive Clean Water Act funding for the North Huron Valley/Rouge Valley wastewater project — known as Son of Supersewer.

EPA officials instructed the DNR — which acts as an agent for the EPA in Michigan — to bypass Son of Supersewer on the funding priority list. The money now is being made available to other projects around the state.

Federal guidelines for the disburse-

ment of Clean Water Act money changed on Oct. 1, including a new maximum of 55 percent and the "no growth" clause.

ALTHOUGH EPA officials cited a variety of deficiencies in the project planning, Hinshon claims growth was one of the major factors for the bypass decision.

"Growth was a concern of the EPA, that there was major growth capacity in the system," Hinshon said.

"We tried to tell them what appears to be major growth capacity was not," he said.

Sewer capacity is measured in the flow of cubic feet per second (cfs).

State considers prison purchase

The Detroit House of Correction (Dehoco) on Five Mile in Plymouth Township could become a medium-security state prison.

"We are very interested in the possible purchase of Dehoco," said Gail Light, a Department of Corrections spokeswoman.

But state Rep. Gerald Law, R-Plymouth Township whose district includes part of Canton, vows to fight any proposal by the state to use the facility as a prison.

"I'm not going to have the Plymouth-Northville area be the correctional

center for the City of Detroit," Law said.

Dehoco is owned and operated by the City of Detroit and houses prisoners serving up to one-year sentences. Detroit wants to close the facility and is negotiating with Wayne County for the transfer of prisoners.

"There should be some movement of prisoners out of Dehoco within the next 30 days," said Mike Conway, a spokesman for County Executive William Lucas.

Without the recent construction of a county jail in downtown Detroit, such a move wouldn't have been possible. Be-

Man arraigned in armed robbery

Canton police have arrested one Ypsilanti man and have a warrant for the arrest of another in connection with an armed robbery early Thursday morning at the Total Gas station at Ford and Canton Center roads.

Michael Eugene Patton, 28, pleaded not guilty to a charge of armed robbery at his arraignment Friday afternoon before 35th District Judge Dunbar Davis.

Bond was set at \$50,000, 10 percent cash, and a preliminary examination is scheduled for Oct. 22.

Police said one of the men, armed with a dark hand gun and wearing a stocking cap, demanded money from the station attendant about 5:15 a.m. The robbers stole \$150, police said. No one was injured. There were no other witnesses.

Heavy-duty garbage bags are available at \$11 for a box of 100 from the City of Plymouth at either the Fire Department or the DPW office.

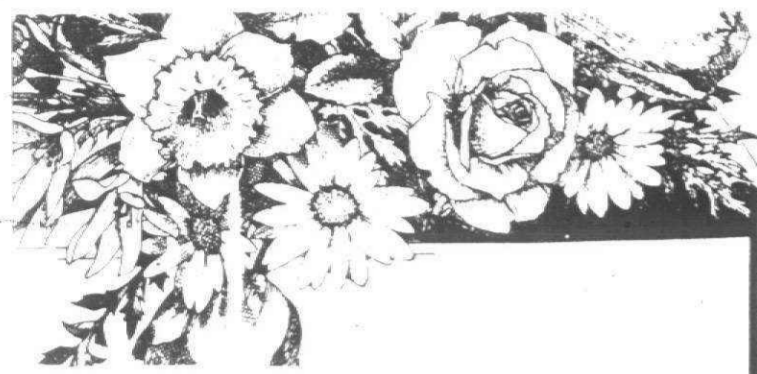
CO-ED VOLLEYBALL

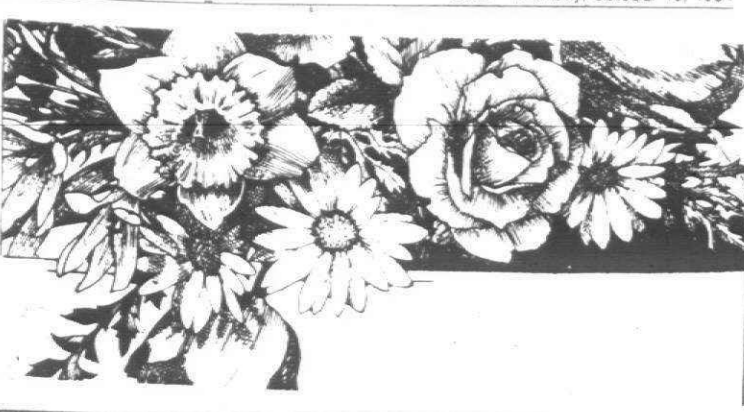

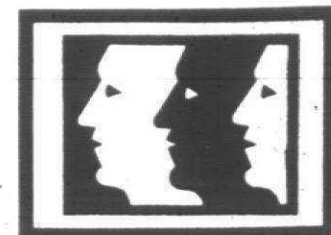

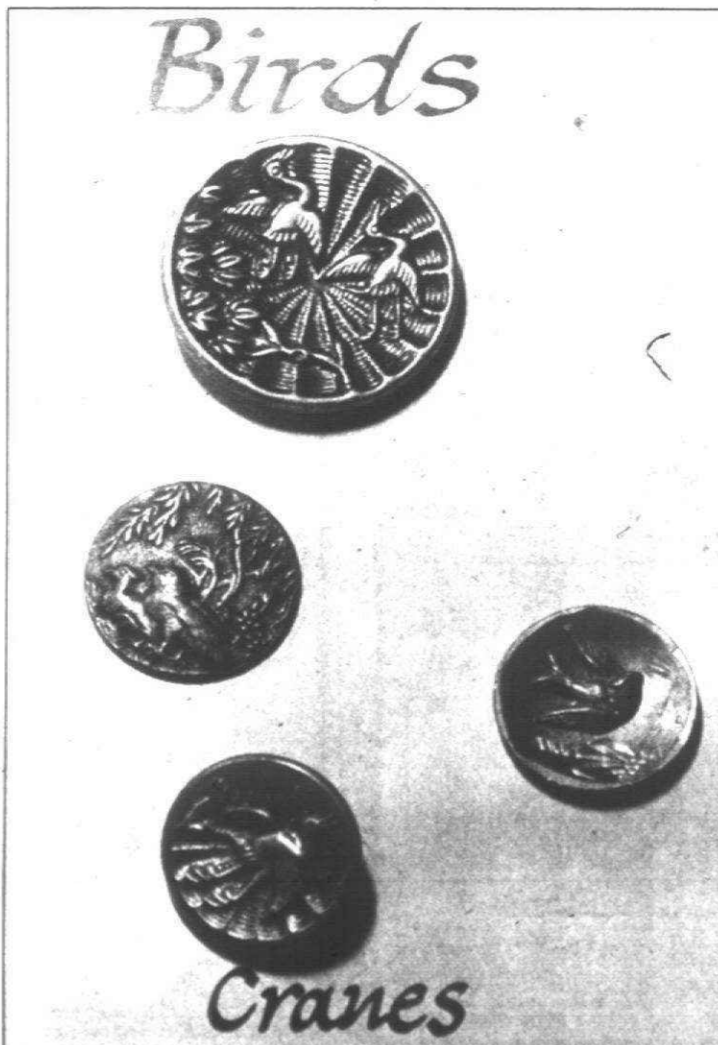

Historical museum shows off its button collection

Thursdays can be a little hectic at the Plymouth Historical Museum. The building is open to the public 1-4 p.m. But groups can be scheduled for off-hours. Take last Thursday, for example. Two school groups from Novi came for the educational lectures on the building's lower level and tours of the museum.

There also were two bus loads of senior citizens — one from Oak Park and another from Roseville. Barbara Saunders, museum director, provides guided tours of the city for these out-of-town visitors. She climbs aboard their bus and, microphone in hand, describes the history of the community, its buildings and homes. The tours are money-makers for the Plymouth Historical Society, as the fee per person goes to the museum. They also pay a fee to tour the museum.

Nov. 11 feature the museum's own collections: the Davenport ivories, button collection, old medical items from the early 1900s, laces and jewelry. Showcases have been arranged with figurines, glassware, and dishes to carry out the theme of the buttons. The flower buttons are complemented with items bearing a flower motif, bird buttons with bird accessories.

Visitors to the museum admire the standing exhibits — the street of shops, the Daisy Air Rifle room, the made-in-Plymouth Alter automobile, the blacksmith shop, the Victorian parlor, kitchen, dining room and bedroom, and other memorabilia. Special exhibits from now through

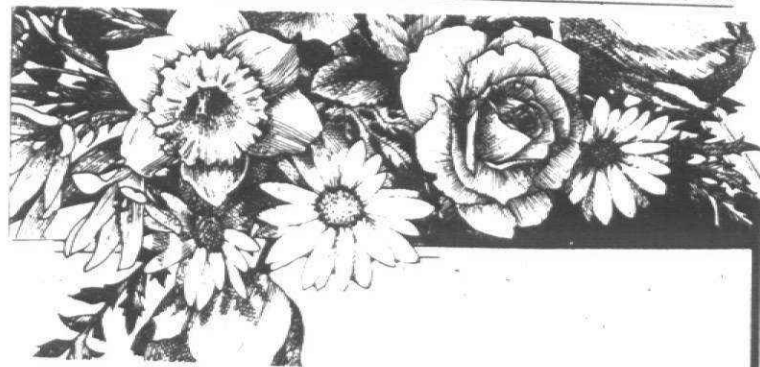

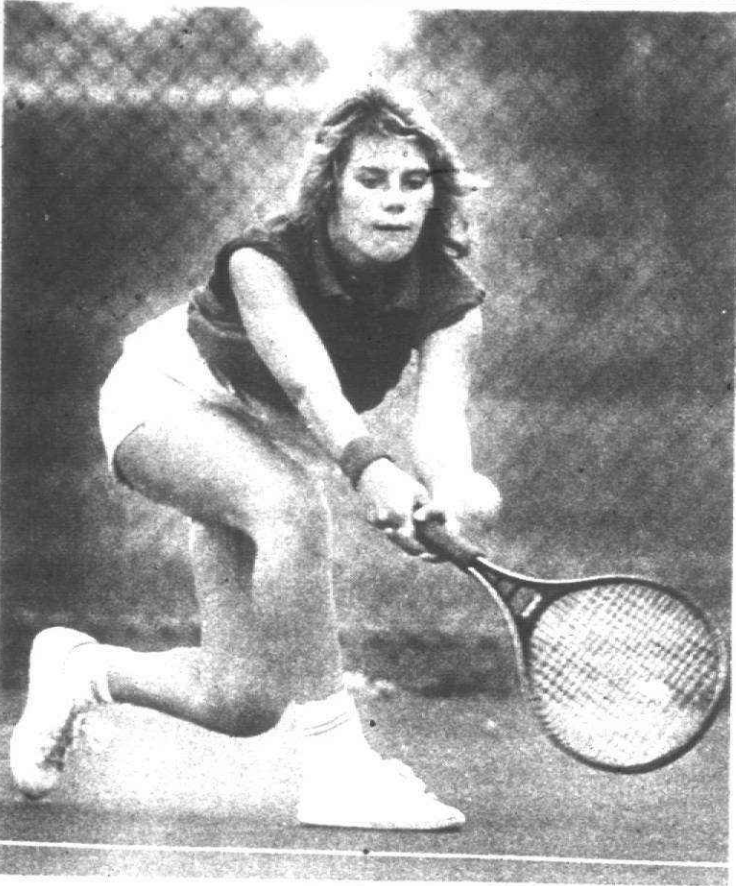
