Residents decry truck troub



With residents concerned that soon as many as 150 garbage trucks a day will pass by their south Canton homes on the way to the local landfill, government officials and the waste hauling company are talking about changes.

officials will begin meeting with executives of Wayne Disposal to try and expedite the opening of the north entrance of the new Canton dump, but they aren't optimistic that the current agree-

ment will be altered.

Supervisor Tom Yack said Tuesday Canton Township and Wayne County. that he would talk with officials at Wayne Disposal to determine if a threeyear cut-off point for using the Van Born-Lilley Road entrance to the dump could be moved up. The matter, however er, had been settled long ago and the

township has little recourse for changing the agreement at this point, Yack said.

"This board has dealt with this issue at least 10 times," he said. "It's a shame these issues were not brought up while we were working on the agree-

Residents along Van Born and Haggerty roads (Canton and Van Buren) said they were not made aware of these discussions, but now they want some

Trucks have not begun to roll yet, but it is expected that by this spring about

150 garbage trucks will make their way past the Van Born Road homes every

We have no control over the route the trucks take except through weight restrictions and rules governing hazardous wastes," said Wayne County Commissioner Bryan Amann. "The trucks can get to the south entrance any way they want to."

Officials say there is no recommended route for trucks presented by the township, but Wayne Disposal officials

Traffic ease expected

Quicker emergency response times and a more even distribution of traffic through the Sunflower subdivision is expected to be the net result of the proposed extension of Hanford Road west of Canton Center Road.

Canton Township trustees last week voted unanimously to consider engineering proposals for the project. Although some property along Canton

Center must still be acquired by the township, officials are certain project will move ahead fairly quickly.

'Hanford is a classic example of something that needs to be finished to complete the puzzle," said public works director Aaron Machnik referring to the general road system in Canton Town-

ship.
Using a computer program, public safety director John Santomauro was able to determine that in some cases a full minute could be shaved from emergency response times when Hanford is extended. That minute, Santomauro said, could mean the difference between life or death and minor property damage or devastation.

Opening of Hanford would distribute traffic through the subdivision more evenly and will offer some relief to residents on Weathersfield Way and Holmes," Santomauro predicted.

Some residents of Holmes, Weathersfield and Edgewood were on hand Tuesday to applaud the trustees action.

"We have so many little kids on our street and the cars just fly by," said resident Julie Darrow, a supporter of the extension.

Planners puzzle out road improvements

Canton Township planners are building a puzzle and the public works chief believes the major pieces will be in place within the next few years.

The summer always means increased activity in the area of road and sidewalk improvements and that is definitely the case in Canton. Public service officials, however, must look beyond this summer to several years ahead.

We're trying to take a more proactive approach," said public works director Aaron Machnik. "We're trying to work ahead on roads in areas where new subdivisions are going in."

It is better, Machnik said, to have the

major roads in place and in good repair before a lot of new residents move into the area creating traffic problems. So far this year Warren Road (1-275

east to Joy Road) and Beck Road (Warren to Joy) have been completed.

Machnik hopes to complete Warren paving one-half mile to the east, Beck between Ford and Warren, and Haggerty between Koppernick and Joy before "I would like to add Hanford Road to

the list, but that may be wishful thinking," Machnik said.
Officials also hope to complete im-

provements to the intersection of Sheldon and Warren roads. Turn lanes will be added to improve the flow of traffic

On top for 1993 is Palmer and Canton Center roads and in 1994 Saltz Road will be the major improvement.

"These are all smaller pieces of a big-ger puzzle," Machnik said. "We are pleased to say that all of Canton Township's work is done and has been submitted to the county.

Engineering studies have been completed, but county approval must be sought before bids on the project are ac cepted.

Most of the road improvements are funded through the township road fund. although some projects are completed with a mix of funding from developers, the township and the county, Machnik

Many of the older sidewalks in the township are being replaced without property assessments, but rather with proceeds from the landfill which Canton hosts.

Millage opposed

Canton Township trustees approved a resolution last week to oppose the Wayne County Aug. 4 millage request.

The request for 0.5 mill is "too vague" and "transfers wealth from the suburbs to the city of Detroit," according to the resolution.

The millage would collect \$14 million for the 'neediest" county residents and, if approved, will be directed to health care programs. The request would cost the average Canton taxpayer \$35 per year. The average township resident now pays about \$575 per year to the county. Currently, 78 percent of all county revenues are generated in the suburbs and 90-95 per-cent of all revenues are spent in the city of Detroit.

"The last thing we need to do is give (the county) more money when we're not doing a good job with the

Amann has launched a tea bag campaign in opposition to the millage request, which was supported by Detroit representatives on the commission as well as Commissioner Kay Beard, who represents Garden City, Westland and Inkster.







Anti-cruelty officials visiting Caesar Thursday found the 950pound Black Bear to be healthy and _well cared for. "He has his fangs and he has his

claws. He is obviously taken care of and treated well," said Sherry Silk. director of operations for the Michigan Humane Society. "He is also very well socialized." Silk was prepared to issue a

warning and prosecute Caesar's owner Thursday, but found no reason to do so. "I don't approve of what they are doing, but the bear is fine," she-

Well-cared for bear

Killian, who also found the bear to be healthy, said Caesar would never survive in the wild now and neither would his offspring.

The 10-year-old bear is the fifth generation of bears born in captivity, according to Mazzola. Caesar has been wrestling for nine years and can expect to live another 30 Members of the Washtenaw Citi-

zens for Animal Rights and Humanitarians for Animal Rights Education called police to warn them of the event and to suggest that it may be in violation of state law. The law states that it is illegal to bait or provoke an animal.

Police on hand

Canton Township Public Safety Director John Santomauro was on hand with several officers to ensure the event did not get out of hand. No tickets were issued by officers, but a report on the event will be submitted to the Wayne County Prosecutor to determine if the event was in violation of the law.

"If the bear or any person's life were in danger, we would stop the event, but otherwise we're just here to observe," Santomauro said Thursday. "It will be up to the prosecutor to decide if it is a violation."



Spotlight on education

Teachers flex union muscle at convention

NEW YORK - Eileen DeHart, a Westland Clinton delegate, thinks AFSCME, the government employes union, may have the biggest bloc of votes at the Democratic National Convention.

Keith Geiger, a former Livonia teacher who heads the National Education Association, says the honor may belong to school employees: 372 delegates and alternates.

But to Luigi (Lu) Battagliari, education is clearly the winner for Democratic attention in Madison Square Garden, in caucuses and on nominee Bill Clinton's agenda.

'What's exciting to me as an educator is the speeches bringing education to the forefront. There's a commitment to children and their well-being," said the Clinton alternate from Rochester Hills.

"The Reagan and Bush adminitrations have talked but done nothing about it. When they talk about education, they say it's 'throwing money' at it. But when they talk about the Pentagon, they say 'allocating funds."

Battagliari, a first-time delegate, teaches in Fraser's program of alternative education for at-risk children aged 12 to 17. "Of the 15 in my program," he said, "only two or three come from Norman Rockwell-type families. The rest come from singleparent families, go from one school to another."

Raised in Dearborn, Battagliari earned degrees from Michigan State in 1972 and 1976. After heading the Fraser Education Association, he now is president of Local 1 covering 16 Macomb districts with 4,400 teachers, bus drivers and school

Programs like Head Start and atrisk kids are vital additions to Clinton's interest in education, Battagliari said. "The money for at-risk programs comes from recapture, the (state) Robin Hood plan."

In New York he attended a reception for U.S. Rep. David Bonior, who faces a tough re-election battle in his now Macomb-based district. Bonior's the best thing that ever happened to Local 1 next to Clinton and Gore," Battagliari said.

He's getting his own taste of Oakland County politics as a Democratic candidate for the board of com-

with those from the American Federation of Teachers. "We had a joint reception Sunday night, and Monday the New York teachers sponsored a boat tour around Manhattan," said Gail Nolin, a Waterford elementary teacher and whip for the Clinton caucus.



Olives and olive oil have ancient history

I really can't tell you which I enjoy more, strolling through a Greek grocery breathing in air scented with Calamatta olives or stirring a few anchovy-stuffed olives in a vodka on the rocks.

I love olives! Whether they're served on a steaming botana or sliced and tossed with some cherry tomatoes and a light viniagrette, I love 'em even more.

Olive history

The olive is one of the oldest known fruit crops. Man grew olive trees even before recorded history. It is not known when the wild olive was first brought under cultivation. But records point to the limestone hills of Attica, the Greek peninsula, as the seat of its first cultivation. The olive is frequently mentioned in the Bible

The Spaniards brought the olive to California in 1769. In the early Franciscan missions, the fruit was pressed for oil and used in cooking and for lamp fuel.

At last count, there were over 15 million acres of olive trees in the world. Each year, over 9 million metric tons of olives, and more than 3 million tons of olive oil are produced. There's no doubt that olive oil, especially the more trendy upscale pressed virgin varieties, are hot sellers in local delis and specialty

Prices range from under \$2 for domestically produced varieties to more than \$30 for some of the more exotic venues.

The countries bordering the Mediterranean Sea grow most of the world's olives, with Italy and Spain taking top honors in both the production of olives and olive oil.

The olive tree is adapted to a hot, dry climate; and does well on many different soils. For bearing fruit, it must have water, along with good drainage. Trees come into production at five years of age, but are not in full production for at least another 10-15 years. They are long-lived however, because it is known that trees brought to the United States by the Spaniards are still bearing fruit.

Harvesting methods

For the production of high quality table olives, the fruit must be picked by hand. Harvesting olives for oil is usually done mechanically, either by knocking the fruit from the trees or by shaking.

Methods for processing olives for the table vary widely. There are three different methods. The traditional Spanish method which has unripe yellowishgreen olives being fermented. Secondly, the American method in which half-ripé reddish fruit is fermented, and lastly, (my favorite) the Greek method, in which fully ripe, dark purple fruit is preserved.

In most processing methods, a weak solution of lye is applied to neutralize the bitter principle. The lye penetrates the olives and hydrolyzes the bitter taste. Then the lye treated olives are immediately rinsed and soaked in water with frequent changes to remove the lve

The washed olives are then placed in fermentation tanks and barrels and covered with brine. The use of lye is not allowed in Greece; instead, they rely on the brine to lessen and mask the bitterness, hence the

Processing olives

Olive oil is produced by mechanical extraction of the ground fruit. Traditionally, this involves three steps - the crushing of the fruit, the pressing (usually two-four times), and the separating of the oil from the liquor.

Most table olives are prepared commercially in ready-to-serve form, using one of these methods Canned or bottled green Spanish olives are usually pitted with the pit cavity being stuffed with pimentos, onions, almonds, anchovies or other edibles.

Canned, ripe American olive production is cen tered in Califorinia. The olives are picked when they are yellow to red in color, cured, and packed in enamel-lined cans, covered with a salt solution, sealed,

Black, naturally ripe olives from Greece are kept on the trees until they are fully matured and completely dark. The fruit is brined with a frequent change of water to hasten the softening of the bitterness Sold mostly by bulk in Greek groceries and some smaller stores, they come whole with pits in-

Olives are low in calories with the average large olive coming in at about five calories each. So the next time you want to swizzle one in your martini, what the heck, ask for two!

The party is just beginning in Spain. There are two events to celebrate - the summer-Qlympic games, and 500th anniversary of the discovery of America by Christopher Columbus whose voyage was financed by Queen Isabella and King Ferdinand of Spain.

Don't forget Spanish explorer Juan Ponce DeLeon who discovered Florida in 1513 while searching for the mythical fountain of youth. Now it's your turn to explore and discover Spain's culinary delights.

'Spanish food is not hot, but it has a lot of flavor from herbs like rosemary. thyme and cilantro," said Angelica Rivadeneira of Beverly Hills who lived in Spain for two years

Like Michigan, Spain is on a peninsula bordered by the Atlantic Ocean and Mediterranean Sea. Fish and shellfish are abundant and featured in many dishes. Vegetables and fruits of all kinds flourish. Spain is known for olives, and Valencia oranges. Olive oil, garlic, saffron, paprika, rice, chickpeas, and smoked sausage are also prevalent in Spanish cooking.

Paella is the national dish. According to legend, it originated centuries ago in Valencia when field workers cooked a communal lunch of rice, vegetables, seafood, chicken, and sausages in a shallow iron skillet (paella pan).

"In Spain when families have picnics they cook paella outside over a fire made from orange tree branches," said Rivadeneira. "The orange wood gives it a special flavor.

Gazpacho, a colorful, chilled tomato, cucumber soup, is another popular

"Spain is old in tradition, the cuisine is part of that tradition, and it continues," said Ismael Durin, manager of Don Ricardo's Spanish restaurant in Redford Township.

Lunch is the main meal of the day in Spain, and is served at 1 p.m. Dinner is served, 8:30-10:30 p.m. Tapas, (appetizers) precede dinner, and are served around 6:30 p.m.

Spanish wine producers make Olympic strides

Spain's acceptance this year as a member of the European Economic Community has given Spanish wine producers a challenge. They've been forced to compete on a quality level with the best wines of Eu-

rope or drown in a sea of wine. During the decade of the 1980s, Spanish producers prepared for the quality challenge in a country with unusual grape varieties perfectly adapted to the soil and climate. One short feature doesn't do Spanish wines justice. There are sherries, cavas (Spanish sparkling wine) and magnificent Riojas on the threshold of greatness to be enjoyed.

If you've not discovered these wines, let the Olympic spirit get you started searching out the superior wines of Vega Sicilia and Pesquera from the Ribera del Duero region. Producers such as Miguel Torres in Penedes and Cordorniu's Raimat estate are soaring to new heights with well-priced bottlings.

Try your hand at matching Spanish wines with ta-- the appetizer-styled dishes unusual to the Spanish way of life which offer the perfect excuse to chat with friends over a glass of wine

The origin of the word tapa, which literally means cover, goes back to Andalucia in the south of Spain, around the middle of the last century, from the name given to a slice of ham, cheese or bread used to cover the wineglass served to the horsemen as they arrived at the roadside inn tired and thirsty. The tape protected the wineglass from dust or rain. In fact, the tapa was free - the patron paid only for the wine.

Before lunch, and the dinner hour in Spain, bars and taverns fill with friendly groups carrying on animated conversations while nibbling small portions of anything edible, from almonds and olives to tiny fried fish or sausages.

Not far from the French border, close to the renees, the Rioja region has been producing table wines since the 12th century. The name Rioja is a contraction of the Rio Oja, a mountain stream in the area which flows into the River Ebro. More than 40 bodegas (wineries) are currently producing Riojas that you will recognize as sensibly priced, flavorful wines made principally from tempranillo and mazuelo

The character of red Rioja wines, rich in color and tannin, develops from the unusual, extended aging in oak casks which is a regional tradition. Conde de Valdemar, a producer with more than a century's experience producing Rioja is relatively new on the Ameri-

tion family bodega began to depart slightly from the traditional Rioja wines. Today, they are without a doubt some of the finest Riojas on the market.

The Torres family has owned vineyards in the Penedes near Barcelona, and produced wine since the 17th century. Their entry into the world market began in 1858. Today, Torres is the largest individually owned producer of premium Spanish wines, and the number one selling Spanish table wine in the United

Available in bookstores "The Catalan Country Kitchen," (\$22.95), authored by Marimar Torres, President of Torres Wine North America, includes 100 recipes and sample menus. It is an excellent way to learn how to prepare tapas, paellas and just about everything that's culinary Spanish. It also includes valuable information on pairing food and wine.



Trained as an opera singer and an accomplished guitarist and pianist, Mills has gone on to produce two records and tour the United States and Cana-

In her possession were 300 songs, not one played before audience. Lynn Miles might have been deemed paranoid as she was prolific, but actually it was a case of her feeling quite vulnerable.

When the Sweetsburg, Quebec, native tells how she became so guarded of her solitary works, the feeling is understandable and makes her songs all that more precious much like the pristine voice from which they originate.

One night, Miles was singing cover tunes at the Bank Cafe in her home of Ottawa, Ontario. The place was full of chatter, no one bothering to notice the singer-songwriter on stage plying her trade. "I got off the stage after the third song of my

set and ran downstairs and cried and cried, said Miles, 33, who performs as part of the La Casa Folk Music Series Friday, July 24, at Birmingham Unitarian Church. "It's very dehumanizing to be on stage and not have one person listen to you. I decided I wasn't going to do that anymore." Miles has come a long way since. She

shunned cover tunes, releasing two albums of her own songs and has emerged as one of Canada's finer up-and-coming musical exports. Her latest, "Chalk This One Up to the

Moon" (Snowy River Records, Box 130, Station B. Ottawa, Ont., Canada K1S), is a ripe collec tion of vivid songs culled from personal experience and forged in sterling folk and country settings. They speak to a restless melancholic romanticism, which is a universal feeling but perhaps more so in the vast trappings of Cana-

"The Venus Motel," a torchy number impec cably sung unstrained in Miles' classically trained voice, tells the story of a lonely woman of 30 who works at the front desk of the inn and wonders if tomorrow will be the day she finds love. Down the road, a man sits in a diner waiting to muster enough courage to pursue his love

The song leaves the pairing unresolved. Do they eventually meet? "Yeah, I think so," Miles said.

"It's Hockey Night in Canada," a willowy folk pop lament, is a metaphor for what Miles perceives as the old boys club mentality that exists in her country. She was inspired to write the number after a well-publicized sexist joke was made by a member of Parliment while in

this pure, angelic voice," Miles said. "It's pure, but it knows a lot at the same time." In terms of songwriting peers, Miles was in spired by the likes of Neil Young, Gordon Lightfoot and Bruce Cockburn. She purposely didn't listen to Joni Mitchell when she was younger for fear she would end up inadvertently sounding like the Canadian artist.

But unlike that evening at the Bank Cafe, one person was listening. Frank Taylor and his wife regularly attended Miles' shows. He convinced Miles not to quit and, as result, became her manager. Her career continues to blossom. leading her to tour Canada and perform in the United States.

So, like the character in her song "The Venus Motel," someone was there. "And I didn't even know it." she said.

Swiss sport international HQ

As top athletes from all continents warm up to compete for gold medals in Barcelona, scores of international sports officials in the lake city of Lausanne, Swit zerland, are already at work planning the 1996 Olympic Games in

The preparation, financing and marketing of the Olympics require an organizational effort comparable to mounting a world's fair or a space program - and it's all done in this pleasant city on the north shore of Lake Geneva. Lausanne proudly calls itself

the Olympic City, displaying in its official logo the five linked rings superimposed on the outline of its 700-year-old cathedral. The headquarters of the Internationa Olympic Committee is in a 19thcentury chateau and an adjacent steel-and-glass structure in the western lakeside suburb of Vid at 9 Route de Vidy (telephone

The founder of the Olympic Games of the modern era, the French educator Baron Pierre de Coubertin, is buried at the Mon toie Cemetery nearby.

Work is in progress on a large new Olympic Museum to house photos, posters, medals, flags and other memorabilia of all Olympic Games, including such artifacts as a bobsled built by Swiss sportsmen for the 1912 Olympics in Stockholm. The museum is to open on June 23, 1993, the 99th anniversary of de Coubertin's call for the first modern Olympics in

Until then, there is still plenty to see and to do in Lausanne. Switzerland's fifth largest city. Built on five hills, it is a cosmopolitan city with spectacular views of the lake and the snowcapped ranges and peaks of the Savoy Alps across it. Thousands of students at Lau-

sanne's university, a prestigious hotel school and several private boarding schools help make Lausanne far more vivacious than most Swiss cities and towns.

Lausanne is 38 miles north of Geneva and linked with that city by a much-traveled lakeshore road Direct trains to Lausanne

Fly-in fishing provides thrill

kept the beat as a steady chorus of zzzzzzzz's came blaring from my fishing reel.
"Nice fish," I thought. "Nice fish."

I'd been fighting him for close to 10 minutes now and after his third run to deep water, my opponent seemed to lose his will. I was able to work him close enough to the boat to identify it, but as soon as he saw the boat my reel began buZZZZing again. The six-pound-test monofilament was stripped from my open-face as the ferocious Northern Pike bolted back into deep water.

My partner, Brian Goemare, and I had patiently trolled this lake in northern Ontario for the better part of two hours without a hit. We'd been marking fish on our Hummingbird all afternoon, but this was the first one we'd actually encountered.

He was 30 yards behind the boat when he decided to feast upon my chartreuse and orange Rattle-Trap. After an exciting 15-minute fight - including four strong runs - a seven-pound, 31-inch Northern pike was finally in the net. Although nowhere near a record catch, the Northern - the biggest I've ever caught - was certainly a trophy in my eyes. It was a cold, windy afternoon, but the battle had left me dripping with sweat and excitement.

A trip to paradise

A feeling of exhilaration had swept over me the day before as the DH C-3 Beaver (four passenger sea plane) touched down on the surface of northern Ontario's Easey Lake.

Yea!" Fexclaimed "Welcome to paradise."

A nearby pair of loons seemed equally inspired as they erupted into a welcoming chorus while we unloaded our gear from the plane

Spending a week in a rustic log cabin in the remote Canadian wilderness may not sound like paradise to some, but to this angler it was one step short of heav-

I had dreamed of a fly-in fishing trip to Canada for many years. Last fall, three friends, Goemare and Neil O'Dwyer of Lake Orion and Larry Axsome of Auburn Hills and I, decided on a trip.

We drove 150 miles north of Sault Ste. Marie to the town of Hawk Junction where we hooked up with our hosts Mary Haight and Kelly Culhane, co-owners of Hawk Air Ltd. We flew another 30 miles into the wilderness before arriving at Easey Lake.

The fun began later that afternoon as Brian broke the ice and caught the first fish of the trip. Trolling an orange and brown Hot-'N-Tot, Goemare landed a relentless 28-inch Northern over a weed bed in 15 feet of water

We spent the first five days of our trip on Easey Lake, catching mostly pike as well as a few walleye and perch, then flew to another lake - Little Missinaible - 30 miles to the east for a walleye bonanza on the final two days of our trip.

Feasting on fish

The excellent walleye and pike fishery in northern Ontario is certainly no secret to Michigan anglers. But when we got to the sea plane base and heard about a 10-pound walleye and a 23-pound Northern coming out of the area two days before we arrived, our excitement rose to another level.

which included high winds, rain and cold temperatures (30s at night and 40s to 50s during the day), we managed to acclimate ourselves with Easey Lake and find some productive holes within the first couple

We caught our fill of three- to four-pound pike and feasted on fish each night. The bigger, trophy-sized pike we were searching for just didn't seem to be interested in our offerings of night crawler harnesses, jigs, minnows, flat fish, Dardevles, Rapalas, spinner baits and the likes.

Little Missinaibie turned out to be a walleye haven as we boated more than 100 fish in a day-and-a-half of fishing. Once our new found friend George Deacon (see accompanying story), an outfitter from Union Lake who works for Hawk Air, showed us where the fish were, crawler harnesses and jigs tipped with night crawlers or minnows turned into walleye mag-

Color seemed to be insignificant. I started out us ing a chartreuse jig, but found equal success with brown, orange, green and white.


A complete package

It wasn't just the daily fill of walleye, pike, whitefish and perch that branded the trip outstanding. It was a combination of Canadian hospitality, great fishing and wildlife encounters that fulfilled my

From pre-trip lists of what gear to bring and maps of the lakes we were fishing to a midweek check, including ice delivery and tips on where and how to catch the fish, our hosts did all they could to ensure that we had fun and success.

O'Donnell aims for Olympic gold

Jennifer O'Donnell of Farmington has traveled thousands of miles to compete, practiced countless hours and devoted much of the last four years to one

Her objective was to make the U.S. Olympic team in women's archery, and her efforts were so rewarded at the Olympic Trials in May. Now she has a new goal.

"I'd like to be in the gold medal match," the 18-year-old O'Donnell said. "I wouldn't be going if I didn't want to bring home the gold.'

O'Donnell will leave Wednesday for the Summer Games in Barcelona, Spain. The Olympics begin July 25 and end Aug. 9, with the archery competition slated for July 31 through Aug. 4.

"I'm excited. It's been my goal the last four years and it's finally here," she said. "I'm happy about it, but there are a lot of other things I'd like to do. I'd like to medal at the games, and I'd like to go again in '96."

International competition is nothing new for O'Donnell, one of three women on the U.S. team who has been to Poland, Norway, Italy, Cuba, Japan and Finland for tournaments in the last

The World Championships in Poland last year were good preparation for the Olympics, according to O'Donnell.

"I finished 17th, but that was my first major competition with people who are the best in the world," she said. "I had been shooting well enough to compete with them, but I never had. I didn't have enough confidence and got blown away by it all.

"I wish I would have done better, but I'm glad I had those kind of problems. I'll be able to deal with that kind of pressure, and I'll know what to expect

when I get over there."

Getting there took a lot of time and effort. O'Donnell, who has been competing seriously since 1987 with the Olympics as her aim, spent her junior year of high school at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo. She returned to graduate from Farmington High School in 1991

"It helped me a lot," she said. "I got to work with sports psychologists, get on a weight-training program and practice more. It made me more aware of what I was doing and more knowledgeable of my equipment and form."

Then came The Trials at Tempe, Ariz. O'Donnell was among 70 women vying for a spot on the Olympic team, but only a handful were in actual con;

"It was only my second outdoor tournament of the year, but as long as I shot well I stood a good chance," she said.

After two days of qualifying, O'Donnell survived two days of elimination rounds and placed second. She will be joined on the team by Denise Parker (18) of Utah, a member of the '88 team. and Sherry Block (21) of Colorado.

"I was actually more relieved than anything because The Trials were over," O'Donnell said. "I didn't have to worry whether I was going or having everyone be disappointed that I didn't make it.

The Olympic format in archery has been changed to make the sport more appealing to a television audience. In the past, the eight remaining archers competed simultaneously for the top three scores and medals.

In 1992, qualifying will be done the first two days, with archers competing in a FITA (shooting 36 arrows from each of four distances). The field will be





and after his third run to deep water, my opponent seemed to lose his will. I was able to work him close enough to the boat to identify it, but as soon as he saw the boat my reel began buZZZZing again. If it's Saturday it must be 'Today'

NBC trades eartoons for news, sports, weather

It's a new day at NBC. The peacock network, which was beaten in the ratings this season by a resurgent CBS, has started shedding its old plumage and is putting out new feathers, all in the hopes of wooing the under-30 crowd for its advertisers.

Gone are "The Golden Girls." "Matlock" and "In the Heat of the Night." Once proud enough to strut with plumes such as these, NBC has dropped them all. Gone, too, are Saturday-morning cartoons. The new NBC is for those 9 and upviewers in their pre-allowance years need not apply. The network is grooming itself for a young, hip, decidedly urban audience.

That means the news. And the weather. And cooking segments, health tips and movie reviews. After launching an overnight news service in November and (finally) getting a workable news magazine off the ground in March, NBC is ready to call it "Today" every day of the

The 40-year-old "Today" show

floandered a couple of seasons ago when the news division underestimated viewer devotion to co-host Jane Pauley, who left the show in January 1990. Audiences

fled the upheaval at "Today" for the dependability of "Good Morning America," only to be lured back late this spring by the smart, bubbly style of Katie Couric.

Riding the tailwind, "Saturday Today" premieres on Aug. 1, smack in the middle of NBC's coverage of the Summer Olympics in Barcelona. Spain. (Talk about your flight insurance). With "Sunday Today," the Saturday edition makes NBC the first broadcast network to present morning news and information seven days a week.

Hosts of the Saturday program, who will occupy the customary "Today" show set, are Scott Simon and Jackie Nespral. Simon is a public-radio veteran who has earned two Peabody awards and an Emmy and currently anchors "Weekend Edition, Saturday" for NPR. On television. Simon has served up the quarterly series "American Pie" on

PBS for two years

Nespral comes to "Today" from Spanish-language network Univision, where she anchored "Noticias v Mas" (News and More), a live, hourlong report, for two

The pair will spend one third of each hour giving news and weather undates. In addition, there will be feature stories and informational segments on travel, cooking and other topics of interest to viewers planning weekend activities.

According to Karen Curry. executive producer of morning news programming, there will be "more emphasis on what people are actually doing on a Saturday."

Nespral and Simon, she adds, were chosen for their diverse talents and backgrounds and for their versatility in moving from hard news to lighter stories. Curry notes that while neither will be pigeon-holed with particular stories, each will bring outside interests to the show. Simon, a big kid from the streets of Chicago, is a sports enthusiast. Nespral, a wife and mother, has an understandable interest in family matters.

Curry's overall aim is to appeal to weekday "Today" viewers while attracting working people who may not have time to watch the show

until week's end

"It will have a little bit of everything," she concludes - with not a little panache.

The Texas billionaire is now sharing his expertise in two videotaped business seminars: Trial By Fire. comprised of Perot tips for building a winning enterprise; and America Under Fire, which deals with the relationship between American business leaders and the U.S. government in regards to the global economy.

Production on the woeful tale of Sarah Ferguson's split from Prince Andrew is currently under way in England. Martin Poll, executive producer of the project, is also working on a miniseries about Fergie's sister-in-law. 

The elusive Emmy passed Susan Lucci (Erica, All My Children) by again, and it was a darn shame. Instead, Erica Slezak (Viki, One Life to Live) won the award for Outstanding Lead Actress, although Jessica Tuck (Megan) and Lucci were much better and had a lot more to work with this past year. Women's basketball team looking for gold in Barcelona

All-star men's team may have to share spotlight

Olympian Clarissa Davis understands all the fuss being made over the United States' men's Olympic basketball team. In fact, she and her teammates on the women's squad may be the biggest fans of America's "dream team."

"Just being around guys like Michael (Jordan) and the others is exciting," says the three-time University of Texas All-American. The whole world wants to see them play and all of us want to see them win the gold as much as

Despite their admiration for the men's team, it's clear the women wish that some of the spotlight falling on their male contemporaries would shine on them. "There are no commercials for women's basketball, but what can you do?" Davis asks philosophically. "I think we'll get more publicity if we fail to win the gold medal than if we win it."

Nobody disputes that the men's team is by far the best ever to take the court in

Olympic competition, and there are some who feel that the U.S. team also has the best women players ever. But, unlike the men, the women won't find the road to the gold a walk in the park.

"It's definitely going to be harder for us than for the men," Davis says. "(The teams from) Cuba and Brazil are playing very well and there are some good European teams. But we've assembled a great group and we're just going to concentrate on winning the

Just the anticipation of participating in the Olympics is exciting for Davis. She is also thrilled at the prospect of playing before American television audiences once again. After graduating from Texas in 1989, Davis, like many American women, had to go to Europe to find a professional team to play for.

"It's kind of a contradiction that the best individual players have to leave their home country where the game was founded in order to be recognized," Davis lamented. "It's weird that the people overseas seem to appreciate us more than our own people," . IV Listing In-
