Recount keeps Whyman w



Longtime Democratic state Rep. Jim Kosteva gave it his best shot, but a recent recount still puts challenger Deborah Whyman in the state House.

It was just something outgoing Democratic state Rep. Jim Kosteva had to do, even though in the end a vote recount showed that Republican challenger Deborah Whyman had still won his longtime seat.

"It made prudent sense to ask for a recount," said Kosteva, who is considering some job possibilities. "We recognized it was a long shot.'

The recount, coordinated by the Wayne County Board of Canvassers and the state Board of Canvassers, Dec. 7-9, showed that Whyman still

won the Nov. 3 election.

"It was a very nerve-wracking thing to go through," Whyman said. In the final analysis, Whyman took

Kosteva's seat by 134 votes. The recount showed that Whyman got 17,148 votes to Kosteva's 17,014. On Election Day, the margin was 155

"Realistically, given the amount of the original margin in the vicinity of 150 votes, you recognize you were hoping for a transcription error, Kosteva said.

Kosteva asked for the recount because of the narrow Election Day

margin, as well as concern about political control of the House and because of his election volunteers' hard

"With all the things at stake with control of the state House, I certainly think what he did was reasonable, Whyman said.

Kosteva called the recount an "interesting process. It's interesting what gets counted as a vote and what doesn't.

Third trial delayed

Add another delay in the continuing murder trials of Dr. Charles Fisher, charged with killing his wife in 1984 by wrapping her face with duct tape in a mock burglary attempt in their Canton house.

A hearing for motions was scheduled earlier this month and was postponed until Jan. 22 due to a personal situation by Fisher's defense attorney, Kenneth Mogill.

Mogill said he will ask visiting Recorder's Court Judge Thomas Roumell to rule on whether police conducted an illegal search.

Mogill also alleges double jeopardy, saying Fisher should not be tried twice for the same crime.

"Certainly there should be no third trial," Mogill said.

Regarding Fisher, Mogill said: "He's trying to get on with his life as well as possible, and he's looking forward to having the matter cleared once and for all," Mogill said.

The motions will precede Fisher's third trial. Two juries found him guilty of first-degree murder in the death of Ella Maria Mercado Fisher in their sprawling Thornwood house in a northwest subdivision.

Almost 10 years later, Mercado Fisher's family continues to wait for the legal proceedings to finally end.

"This last year has been a night-Mercado Fisher's mother, Evelyn Mercado, said referring to Fisher's release from prison in Janu-

The Michigan Supreme Court reversed Fisher's second conviction, ruling that a diary kept by Mercado Fisher should not have been admitted

Funding of sex-ed film sparks delay

Adoption of "Considering Cona reproductive health film, was tabled by the Plymouth-Canton school board last week after an audience member pointed out that funding for the movie was provided by a condom manufacturer. The film was recommended by the

district's sex education committee.

Kathy Rucinski, a registered nurse and a member of the sex education committee, informed the board that funding and materials for "Considering Condoms" were donated by Carter-Wallace, which produces Trojan condoms.

Rucinski and other members of the audience said the movie, produced by **SCHOOLS**

the National Education Association, contains errors and condones teenage

"The film does not mention that there is any failure rate to condoms, said Rucinski. "The booklet produced by the NEA says there is only a 2-percent failure rate for people using condoms regularly to prevent pregnancy. The figure is actually 15.7 per-

"The HIV virus is 450 times smaller than a sperm cell," she added, which enables the virus to permeate a condom and potentially infect an individual "every day of the week."

"Sixty-three percent of sexually-

transmitted diseases occur among persons less than 25 years of age, according to the Center for Disease Control," Rucinski added.

Before audience members commented, board members offered their opinions.

Trustee Barbara Graham said, "I don't oppose the film, but I see very little on abstinence. If we're going to show movies, what are the expectations? What are we trying to accomplish? We're getting closer and closer to what some people might view as controversy.'

Trustee Dean Swartzwelter said the curriculum should "give students the tools they need to evaluate their personal circumstance." This will enable them to, down the line, "avoid

getting the HIV virus, or to find out if they do have it. I believe that's the health item being represented.

Board member Carl Battishill supported the film. "It behooves us to bring to kids every possibility they can experience if our young people are going to make good decisions. If our committee has made good decisions, I trust them.

More than 30 sex ed committee members approved "Considering Condoms." Rucinski was one of two members who voted against it. Board member Dave Artley said

he'd like to see a list "of the make-up of the committee and their original charge. There is a lot of participation,



Warm mixed drinks perfect for wintertime

Anytime of the year is a good time for a well mixed drink, but wintertime is particularly good for a well mixed hot drink. Now we're not talking hot Ovaltine here folks. Let's refer to these confections as pres-ski drinks that are sure to warm the heart as well as the soul.

Of course, these drinks are not limited to the likes of Jean-Claude Killy and Suzie Chaffee. (Olympic skiers) Let it be known that these drinks were enjoyed by the sedentary couch potato as well as the winter sportsman in our family.

A close relative, who acknowledges the fact that she was not born with a spatula and whisk in her hand, found these recipes delectable and easy to prepare. (This was after reminding her that if one can manage day after day to blend satisfactory amounts of cream and sugar into their morning coffee, one can manage these recipes!)

Measure carefully

When preparing warm potables, be sure to measure all ngredients carefully. Try not to imitate those free pouring bartenders who trust the lick of a wrist and the tip in their pocket.

The subtle blend of flavors that make a warm mixed drink memorable results from a precise combination of ingredients. Use standard measures like teaspoons and jiggers, ounces, cups or

When multiplying quantities for party drinking, try and be as mathematically accurate as possible.

Use fresh ingredients

For the best in concoctions, use the very freshest of ingredients. A fresh squeezed orange will have triple the ffect and taste from a quart of re-concentrated flavored water that was sitting in your freezer for one month.

The surviving half jug of wine left over from the holidays will not not have the flavor and kick of a

just opened bottle. Unless a recipe advises to the contrary, don't slice fruit until just before serving. Oxidation ill detract from the taste you so ainstakingly tried to

You don't have to use premium wines and liquors because blending overpowers the ubtlities that give premium brands their characteristic qualities. On the other hand, cheap substitutes will come off tasting too art or annic so it's best to use a "middle of the road" bottle for making the

Serve the drink in a suitable glass, cup or mug and be sure that it is sparkling clean, free from any soap or dishwasher residue. A preheated cup is a real treat.

wrap them in a damp bath towel and place in a microwave on high power for 1 minute. Watch out, the towel will be hot! There's little argument that a hot sangria just doesn't make it in a plastic Care Bears' mug

Heating ingredients

Heat your ingredients very carefully. Slow heating will give your flavors time to marry, but boiling will drive away the flavor and will leave a "urnt"

These toppings are better left to warm ocktails created with liquor as the weeteness can ffect the taste of warm wine drinks.

A word to the wise, after mbibing, stay off the oads and slopes. Drinking and driving don't mix.

After a succession of toasts, one of the elaborate feasts of that era might have included oyster stew, stuffed pike, cinnamon cabbage, mince pies and plum pudding. At the center of the long banquet table would sit, the prized, roasted boar's head surrounded with garlands of laurel.







'Dr. Quinn' a prescription for romance, adventure

Boston meets frontier in family drama

By Dan Rice

In her new period piece TV series. Jane Seymour strays from the customary glamour of her miniseries. but, thank the producers, her romantic image remains intact. The author of Jane Seymour's Guide to Romantic Living manages to pull some heart strings in a frontier setting in Dr. Quinn, Medicine Woman, which has a preview on Friday, Jan. 1, then enters its regular time slot on Saturday, Jan. 2.

Shot in soft, warm hues, Dr. Quinn is visually inviting. In the years following the Civil War, Dr. Michaela Quinn (Seymour) is a Boston physician who shares a practice with her father, also a doctor. His death brings an end to her practice in the city, for without his credibility. Michaela is not accepted in her profession by reason of gender. Believing she will only find work in another world, Michaela responds to an ad for a town doctor in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Upon her arrival in the Rocky

Mountain mining town, Michaela learns the prejudice against female doctors exists there as well. The Rev. Johnson (Geoffrey Lower), who placed the ad, wants to send her back to Boston when he discovers she's not a man, but Michaela holds firm with the help of two allies: Charlotte (Diane Ladd), the town mid-wife, and Sully (Joe Lando), a

tomahawk-toting, enigmatic young

man who is a liason to the local

Chevenne tribe.

Michaela finds that getting her first patients is as hard as pulling teeth, but she perseveres, only to have new troubles in her life. Before dving of a snakebite. Charlotte requests that Michaela take care of her three children, played by Chad Allen, Erika Flores and Shawn Toovey. Then Michaela becomes involved with the Chevenne, who are being forced into conflict by the Army, and Sully, her knight in moccasins, becomes a closer friend.

Seymour, herself the daughter of

a doctor, was immediately drawn to the character.

"I like the idea of a woman who is more than just a survivor." Sevmour says. "She's a woman who's strong, courageous, and who deals with adversity with the best of feminine instincts."

Executive producer Beth Sullivan is equally thrilled with the casting. "(Seymour) seemed to be the perfect blending of someone who could portray Boston - carry it with her inside - and yet still have the guts to jump on a horse and let her hair fly.

To avoid the harsher weather of Colorado, the series was lensed at California's Paramount Ranch As for historical accuracy, Dr. Quinn rates better than average. The medical wonders Michaela brings to the frontier consist of only a few powders. ointments and a crude stethoscope, and there is plenty of bitethe-stick anesthesia and kitchentable surgery for Western-movie fans to appreciate.

Seymour takes her new character and all the trappings in stride.

I'm an actress. I Play it all. That's what I love to do."





The Marquis Theatre-An Historic Note

Northville historic landmark, is a beautifully restored structure with almost eighty years of rich history and tradition. Elegantly constructed along a Victorian theme, it was built as an opera house and later presented live vaudeville. Charlie Chaplin and Mary Pickford were among the stars who appeared at the theatre. The interior of the theatre has been extensively refurbished. The space in the lobby, where the beautifully designed stained glass windows are now located. was once an open space. It allowed patrons, for a mere 5¢, to listen to, and enjoy, the live entertainment of the day. The lushly upholstered seats, with the wrought-iron framework, were chosen to re-create the original Victorian theme.

The Marquis has presented hit shows (Oklahoma, Carousel, Gypsy, A Little Night Music, Annie, Nunsense, and Driving Miss Daisy): top performers (Count Basie, Woody Herman, The Ink Spots. The Marquis Light Opera has become a resident professional company and will regularly present fully staged light-opera and operettas. In recent years the Marquis has been specializing in children's theatre, capturing the imagination of our young audiences with feature shows such as Peter Pan. The Wizard of Oz. Charlotte's Web, Rumplestiltskin, and many more.



Heston twixt heaven and Hell's Kitchen

Charlton Heston knows the value of good material. The star of the biblical epicsThe Ten Commandments, Ben-Hur and The Greatest Story Ever Told now lends his powerful voice to the four-part performance documentary Charlton Heston Presents the Bible.

starting Sunday, Dec. 20, on A&E.

The actor worked his way up from a humble beginning. Born Charles Carter, the Michigan native studied on an acting scholarship at Northwestern University before enlisting for a stint in the Air Corps. Back in civilian life. Heston and his wife, Lydia, moved to New York's Hell's Kitchen, where he worked sporadically as an artists' model before getting his first break in community theater.

After his 1948 Broadway debut in Antony and Cleopatra, Heston found work in the new medium of live tele-

vision, in programs such as Studio One. He crossed the bridge to Hollywood in 1950 with the film noir Dark City. Since then he has made his mark as the lead in many historical dramas, but his roles in fictional films are equally memorable: Ruby Gentry, Treasure Island, Planet of the Apes, Will Penny and Soylent Green are but a few.

Politically outspoken, Heston has served six terms as president of the Screen Actor's Guild and chairman of the American Film Institute, but is not interested in public office.

E! Entertainment Television is working with the Los Angeles chapter of the National Organization for Women (NOW) to develop programming addressing a variety of women's issues as they pertain to entertainment. The relationship began when NOW threa ened a boycott effort in response to E!'s hiring of abrasive talk-show host Howard Stern.

Conan softens image for cartoon series

Since 1933, books about Conan, a warrior from an age of wizards and kings, have held the imagination of armchair adventurers. More recently, Conan has become a Marvel Comics superhero and the protagonist of two films starring Arnold Schwarzenegger.

This season, a younger, gentler Conan has turned up in Conan, the Adventurer. a syndicated weekly cartoon saga. Conan is a robust action series strong on fantasy and imagination and light on hacking and gouging.

Though he's more humane, Conan still champions the cause of justice, but quick thinking and some cleverly drawn escape routes allow him to do so minus the bloody swordplay. Where the gore is no more, catty humor and magical meanies abound.


The 18-year-old hero brandishes a sword forged by his father from a metal discovered in the wake of a meteor shower. His friends include the telepathic Needle, archer Falkenar circus girl Jezmine and the good wizard Greywolf. There's also Conan's black stallion, Thunder, who can outrun any horse. Together, they seek the villain Wrath-Amon, who has turned all the inhabitants of Conan's village to stone. The episodes unfold in comic-book fashion, with flashbacks smack in the middle of a story line.

Conan may speak softly and carry a big sword, but, remembering he could put an eye out, he never uses it.


