State vows to honor airport pact



State officials have no plans to move a runway at Mettetal Airport in Canton 300 feet south. Any such move of the runway would require approval from Canton Township.

Michigan Aeronautics Commission Director Bill Gehman says the state has no intention of breaking its agreement with Canton Township.

"We have no intention of shifting the runway," said Gehman, who will

attend the Mettetal Advisory Board's next meeting, 7 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 6. "I'm sure there will be more discussion at that time."

What is prompting Gehman's attendance is long-term plan — included in a wish list for Mettetal Airport by manager Randy Collier — that

would move the runway 300 feet south. The plan would require approval from Canton Township, as required in the agreement with the state.

"We're going to come and we're going to listen. We're going to point out what we thought was an agreement, a gentleman's agreement," said Bob Zaetta of the Concerned Citizens group, which has monitored the status of Mettetal over the years.

Collier, state Bureau of Aeronautics licensing and enforcement manager, reviewed the wish list with the advisory board in early December. At that time, board member Mike Stankow of Plymouth Township charged Collier with violating the spirit of the agreement between the state and township.

"I think he felt from an operational standpoint that it was appropriate," Gehman said, explaining Collier's inclusion of the long-term plan in the wish list of improvements for the state-owned airport at Lilley and Joy roads.

Wayne County to plow, salt more Canton roads

Snowy roads in the south end of Canton will get more attention from county plows and salt trucks this winter.

Township Supervisor Tom Yack and Bob Mahoney, Wayne County director of roads, announced the agreement Wednesday at Canton Township Hall.

It calls for the salting and plowing of 8.64 miles of highly traveled local roads, the same service provided on county primary roads.

"We're excited about the opportunity to improve the road conditions in our community," said Yack.

The service will be provided at a cost to Canton of \$2,000 per mile, estimated at \$17,280 for the season. The county will cover the remaining \$2,000 to \$3,000 it costs to clear each mile, according to the agreement.

The annual cost to salt one mile of a two-lane road for one winter —

based on county storm data — is \$4,000 to \$5,000. The anticipated costs would cover about 35 passes by county road crews each year.

The roads designated under the agreement met a county-set criterion of carrying an average of 500 cars or more per day.

They are Sheldon and Lilley, both between Ford and Michigan; Lotz between Michigan and Palmer; Warren from Beck to a half-mile west; and Cherry Hill from Ridge to Napier.

"Many of our residents express concern each year for the road conditions in our community," Yack said. "These roads in the county program are all well-traveled and it is important to keep them clear and safe."

"This will significantly reduce the number of phone calls I get," Yack said, smiling.

Nancy Spencer, who lives in the Stonegate subdivision, said she and

Lansing pols still trying to rebuild school finance

The school tax bills that emerged from the House's all-nighter Dec. 10 differed in one major respect from the deal cut by the bipartisan legislative team (BLT).

If voters approve a 2-cent increase in the sales tax next February, the bills will cut homestead property taxes from 16 mills to zero, but will leave the income tax rate at 6 percent.

The original BLT plan called for using a higher sales tax to reduce homestead property taxes to nine mills and rolling back the income tax to 5.3 percent.

"That was Martin's amendment," said Rep. Sue Munsell, R-Howell, a key player in the BLT deal, referring to Rep. Bill Martin, R-Battle Creek. "It was the most substantial change. It almost derailed the package."

The House broke for 45 minutes of negotiations and caucuses, during which leaders decided to accept the Martin amendment.

"The Democrats decided they could live with it," Munsell said.

Politics of 57

With 56 votes needed to pass any bill, the House gave the most controversial bills margins of exactly 57 yes votes.

It was done by pre-arrangement so that any one representative could tell constituents: "If I had voted no, it would have made no difference because they had 56 votes to pass it."

Here is how area lawmakers voted:

Income tax increase (HB 5106) — passed 57-49:
YES — Republicans Lyn Bankes of Redford, Barbara Dobb of Union Lake, Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills, Shirley Johnson of Royal Oak; Democrats Maxine Berman of Southfield, David Gubow of Huntington Woods, William Keith of Garden City.

NO — Republicans Penny Crissman of Rochester, John Jamian of Bloomfield Township, Greg Kaza of Rochester Hills, Jerry Vorva of Plymouth and Deborah Whyman of Canton; Democrats Justine Barnes of Westland

and Richard Young of Dearborn Heights.

Kaza put on an on-the-record protest into the House Journal explaining his no vote: "Legislative pensions remain exempt from the state income tax. Pensions of federal and state government employees remain exempt. There are no exemptions for the private pensions of senior citizens. There is no cost-containment. . . no budget cuts."

Single business tax increase (HB 5109) — passed 57-50:
YES — Republicans Lyn Bankes of Redford, Barbara Dobb of Union Lake, Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills, Shirley Johnson of Royal Oak; Democrats Maxine Berman of Southfield, David Gubow of Huntington Woods, William Keith of Garden City.

NO — Republicans Penny Crissman of Rochester, John Jamian of Bloomfield Township, Greg Kaza of Rochester Hills, Jerry Vorva of Plymouth and Deborah Whyman of Canton; Democrats Justine Barnes of Westland

Kaza's formal protest said two-thirds of those who responded to his poll opposed tax increases without cost-containment, and "there is no cost-containment tied to this tax package."

Whyman's formal protest said, "When school operating taxes were removed from homesteads, the transfer tax was introduced to generate revenue. School operating tax has been partially reinstated. I believe this (transfer) tax should have been eliminated when property tax was reinstated."

State property tax authority (HB 5111) — passed 57-49:
YES — Republicans Bankes, Crissman, Dobb, Dolan, Jamian, Johnson and Vorva; Democrats Berman, Gubow and Keith.

NO — Republicans Kaza and Whyman; Democrats Barnes and Young.

General property tax (HB 5115) — passed 57-43. It ties property tax cuts to the sales tax increase and restores property tax support of intermediate school districts:

YES — Republicans Bankes, Crissman, Dobb, Dolan, Jamian, Johnson and Vorva; Democrats Berman, Gubow and Keith.

NO — Republicans Kaza and Whyman; Democrats Barnes and Young.

several neighbors have complained in recent years over the condition of Lilley Road south of Cherry Hill after snowfall.

"They just don't do them; they wait four or five days before they clear Lilley," Spencer said.

"I'm glad they're going to do it, but we've been paying taxes to the

county; why require Canton Township to pay more money for something they (Wayne County) should be doing . . . anyway?" she said.

The agreement, which follows discussion between the two parties for over two years, is the first between Wayne County and a

township to salt and plow local roads.

The county's portion of funds will come from money allocated to Wayne County from the Michigan Transportation Fund, Mahoney said. Canton's portion will come from the township's department of public works budget.

"With everyone experiencing budgetary problems, we all need to be a little more creative and a lot more flexible," said county executive Ed McNamara.

"I think we have accomplished both in this case with a positive result for everyone involved," he said.

issue, particularly Collier's announcement that parcel 12, south of the airport — over which the state has an air easement — would be purchased for the runway shift, Gehman added, "I don't think he realized the sensitivity of the issue."

The agreement between the state and township that accompanied the state's purchase of the airport, guarantees certain safeguards for residents, including no expansion of the airport and maintaining the runway at 2,556 feet. The agreement requires that any change to the runway or purchase of parcel 12 would require township approval.

he done," said Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack.

He said he would not entertain any request for runway shifting. "Save the driving. Don't bother. The ink is barely dry."

Gehman acknowledged, as did Collier, that the proposed long-term plan to move the runway 300 feet south does not make the runway longer in feet. Collier said the effort would improve safety at Mettetal.

"But that's not our intention. We intend to abide by the agreement," Collier said in early December.

Stankow, however, is suspicious. "It's really a gut thing with me. This is a perfect example of why people don't trust government."

Stankow believes safety isn't the issue. "You're telling us it's safe. We're holding you to that," Stankow said, referring to earlier comments by state officials, who assured residents the airport was safe.

Stankow also takes exception to the list compiled and organized by Collier. It didn't include the

items he submitted, or many items from other board members. "His (Collier's) list took on another life," Stankow said.

His list included short-term goals of community safety, quality of life, maintaining the spirit and letter of the state agreement, and finding means to enforce quality of life and safety issues at the airport. His long-term goal was airport financial self-sufficiency.

INTERMITTENT CLAUDICATION & ARTHRITIS
An episode of arthritis may be the explanation, if, while walking, you develop pain in a leg. Another cause is that you are not receiving adequate blood supply to the muscles of your leg.

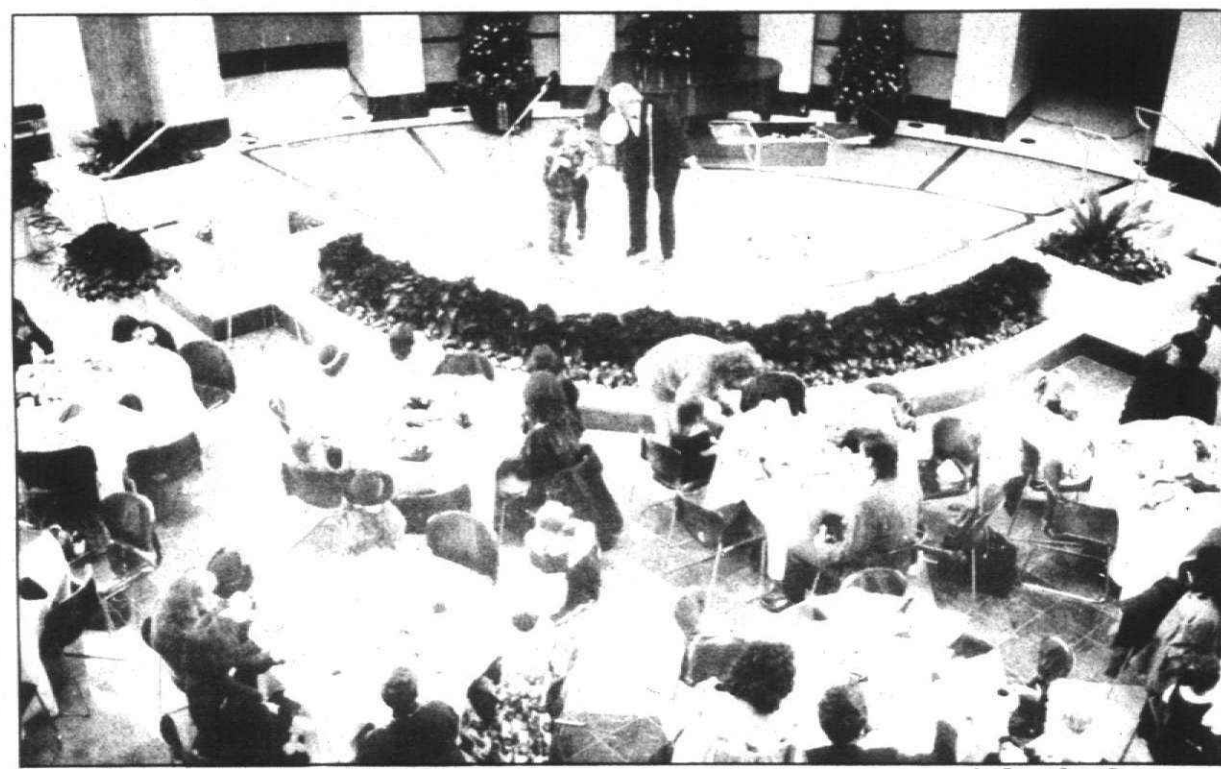

Ingrained sexism shows that no one 'gets it'

Poor Paul Denenfeld. He's an attorney for the American Civil Liberties Union who took the place of Lisa Gleicher, another ACLU attorney, at a recent forum on pornography. Hosting the program was the WomenCenter on the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College.

Denenfeld was uncomfortable and said so when he claimed that Gleicher, who was tied up in Lansing, was better suited to argue the subject of pornography as a mode of free speech. A woman, was his specious argument, should have opposed Carolyn Fletcher Sharpe, assistant dean at the University of Detroit Mercy law school.

Denenfeld missed Sharpe's message—that incidents of pornography can involve men as well as women, children as well as adults and gays as well as the "straight" community. And an audience member told him so.

"Men just don't get it," said the young woman, who had listened intently throughout the program. "Most violent crimes are against women and vio-

lence is shown in pornography. "All people are afraid, but women don't get a voice."

Sounding more like he was trying to win a case than understand the point of view, Denenfeld said that only violent sex crimes are directed more against women.

"Men just don't get it." That premise kept me amazed in the last two weeks at how differently men and women think as certain events unfolded. But this is not about a battle of the sexes; it's about dominance, power, anger and harm.

Even my two Joes apparently don't understand, and that hurts. After listening to them on the radio so often, I feel that I know them on a first name basis. One, J.P. McCarthy, I wake up to every morning; the other, Joseph Antonini, who heads Kmart, is on J.P.'s show so often I think of him as my personal financial adviser and Kmart greeter.

Anyway, on a recent radio show, McCarthy told what I considered to be a very sexist joke about best-selling dolls. The male doll wants to cuddle,

do dishes and go to the mall; the female doll does nothing but keep her mouth shut. Antonini's reply was to tell McCarthy that he was "right in line."

Did Antonini really believe that, or was he just being polite? I don't know, but I wondered how many women listeners of WJR and customers of Kmart thought the joke was funny.

Certainly no one could in any way call my two Joes pornographers, but they should have heard Sharpe's definition of pornography as that which depicts the subject as an object in a

graphically sexual way.

They also should have heard the argument between Denenfeld and Sharpe over whether pornography was an issue of free speech or harm done. What neither men nor women understand is that it is both.

We are free in this country to speak, write, compose music and produce art that is pornographic. But we are also free not to; moreover, we have the responsibility to accept the consequences of our actions.

Doing just that are Toys R Us stores, a nationwide chain with a location in Southfield, that is pulling one graphic video game from its shelves.

That's also why right now there are at least two women, written about by Ted Schneider in his column on McDonald's and Wayne's World videos, who are engaged in what Denenfeld calls counterspeech—the act of opposing what they see as harmful.

Now my colleague, Ted, thinks those women ought to get a life, but I contend they have a much better life than

those who wink and nod over the not-so-subtle nuances of sexism found in some venues.

We also have to take responsibility for our inaction. It will be that women "just don't get it" either when they allow themselves to be debased without objection, for a wide variety of reasons.

During the forum, Denenfeld argued that banning pornography would limit free speech, a First Amendment right. Sharpe said that wasn't her mission. Sharpe said she believes women ought to have the right to sue, if they can prove they have been harmed by incidents of pornography.

Let the debate continue. And in the meantime, I wish my two Joes a happy holiday season. But most of all, I wish they would be more conscious of the impact that subtle, ingrained sexism can have on the public.

Union to businesses: Give us money for political fund

Just when one thinks the Michigan Education Association leadership can't be more outrageous than it already has been, MEA chiefs outdo themselves.

The union set up a political fund to fight Gov. John Engler's proposals, giving it the grandiose name of Public Education Survival Defense Fund (italics added).

Then its data processing subsidiary, MEDNA, wrote a letter to its business suppliers with this heavy-handed suggestion:

"We are seeking your help by requesting a financial donation. The suggested donation is one-half of 1 percent of all business the MEA family corporations paid to your organization over the last 12 months."

How would you label that? A shakedown? Strong-arming? Extortion?

Rep. Burton Leland, D-Detroit, said he had received a copy of my column about his secrecy bill from Rep. Greg Kaza. Leland said the column was incorrect in saying The Detroit News used records to track him to Okemos Township. He said his auto registration lists his Detroit residence.

I will take his word for it. The News did use auto registrations in the course of investigating four lawmakers but not necessarily in his case.

Leland volunteered some words about how he enjoyed fouling up the efforts of blanky-blank reporters selling their dash-dash newspapers and

feeding the public bleep—or words to that effect. His vocabulary is pungent if limited.

The chief argument remains: Leland's bill is no "anti-stalking" measure. It's aimed at closing down what have been public records to all but a governmental elite. Slicker'n al-

gae, he maneuvered it into the Legislature's transportation committees and away from those dealing with public records and criminal law.

Speaking of Greg Kaza, the Rochester Hills Republican used the federal Freedom of Information Act to investigate the Michigan Department of Treasury's investment track record, which Kaza calls "fiscal irresponsibility."

Treasury failed to conduct a standard investment analysis, Kaza said, before purchasing \$7.6 million of stock that later declined 42 percent in value. The Michigan Public School Employees Retirement System invested \$5 million, the Michigan State Employees Retirement System \$2.5 million and the Michigan State Police Retirement System \$100,000. In 1988 they bought

stock in Metropolitan Realty Corp. at \$10 a share.

The stock was an initial public offering (IPO). "One study of 3,186 IPOs brought to market during the 1980s found that only one-third had a market value above their issue price by the end of the decade," said Kaza.

His source: Securities and Exchange Commission records in Washington.

NEA president, ex Livonia teacher comes home

The number-one reason that Minnesota parents support choice of public schools across district lines is to have a babysitter before or after school.

That's what National Education Association president Keith Geiger said research reveals when it comes to the schools of choice issue.

About five years ago, Minnesota became the only state to offer schools of choice across district boundaries, Geiger said.

The issue is important here as schools of choice is one facet of Gov. John Engler's plan to reform education in Michigan.

"So if we want to talk about choice, let's be honest about why parents are utilizing choice," Geiger said. "It is not to get a better education for their child. It is to have their kids near a Grandma or a Grandpa, an aunt or an uncle, so that they can have free babysitting after school."

Geiger spoke twice Monday at the Livonia Education Association's office on Munger—first to four print reporters, then to a closed audience of area union officials from which the press was barred.

Charter school concept proposals are often a "back door way of getting vouchers for private/parochial school," Geiger said. "Charter schools should not be put in place to violate a collective bargaining agreement or to get rid of teacher tenure," he said.

LEA president Nancy Shaw invited Geiger, a former Livonia teacher, to speak prior to the meeting.

Geiger discussed with educators the California Teachers Association's defeat of Proposal 174, which would have given private and religious schools in California \$2,600 for each student enrolled. The November ballot initiative was defeated by a sound 70-30 margin. The NEA contributed \$1 million to defeat the proposal.

The NEA will decide in February how much money it will contribute to lobbying efforts in Michigan, Geiger said.

A former Michigan Education Association president, Geiger began his career as LEA president. He is a former math and science teacher at Stevenson High School. Geiger has been NEA president since 1989, running unopposed this year.

Geiger said the NEA supports schools of choice, but only among public schools. The lobbying group opposes the use of tax dollars for private schools.

Charter school concept proposals are often a "back door way of getting vouchers for private/parochial school," Geiger said. "Charter schools should not be put in place to violate a collective

bargaining agreement or to get rid of teacher tenure," he said.

Allowing parents to choose a school outside their district of residence is probably harmful to education, Geiger said.

"We're spending more money getting kids from one district to another. It's not benefiting them at all," he said.

He went on to say that the fi-

nancial disparity among school districts in Michigan is largely a result of lack of federal funding and responsibility. States are expected to foot more of the bill for education without additional resources. Geiger argues that research indicates teachers are still underpaid nationally.

Engler will spur confrontation if he believes he can put the union in its place, Geiger said.

On other issues, Geiger said: "Test scores for minority students have been increasing over the last 5-10 years, while those for white students have been staying level."

"If you take the same socio-economic students, test scores for public school students always score as good or better as students in private schools. The biggest determining factor of a kid's score is

family income. The obvious solution is not to worry about teachers' salaries but to make sure that all parents make \$100,000 a year. That would take care of it."

"Electing the President of the United States pales in importance compared to the thousands of people that the president appoints that we have lived with for 12 years and this organization is now dealing with."

Livonia teachers don't like Engler

The Livonia Education Association is unwavering in its dislike of Governor John Engler's school reform proposals.

Anti-Engler messages abound in the hallway of the Association's office on Munger in Livonia.

Even lifelike cardboard models of President Bill Clinton and First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton sport badges reading "Yes Schools. No Engler." and "Save Our Schools. Bump Engler."

MEA union locals in the metro-Detroit area came Monday to hear National Education Association president Keith Geiger speak. Some paid a \$1 to the "Survival Defense Fund," pinning on badges that read "Don't Trust Engler," and "Engler Hates Me."

The NEA is expected to provide monetary help next year when the school reform issue heats up in the Michigan legislature.

"It makes me happy to hear Keith say that the battle that we are fighting in Michigan regarding vouchers, etc. is not totally unusual (in the country), said Elaine Miller, a 30-year Redford Union High School teacher and president of Wayne County MEA/NEA. "This is something that so far has been deemed unacceptable by the public across the country. I'm happy that he (Geiger) appreciates what I do."

So far, vouchers have only passed in Milwaukee, according to Jacqui Thomas, MEA communications coordinator. That city has approved \$2,500 per pupil, but only for disadvantaged children, she said.

Julius Maddox, MEA president wants citizens to know all of the ramifications. "We will also potentially become involved in a petition campaign," Maddox said.

During an earlier news conference, Geiger took issue with a June 7 *Forbes* Magazine article, "Suffer the Little Children. How the Na-

tional Education Association Corrupts Our Public Schools."

Forbes maintains that increased spending and high teachers' salaries have produced only deteriorating student test scores. The article also said that the NEA now has more members than the Teamsters.

"We work from a point of view that isn't right or wrong," Geiger said. "This just happens to be a point of view that we believe in."

He called the article "lies and fabrication." Forbes isn't read by many people in the United States, Geiger said, but right-wing churches have extensively reproduced and distributed the article.

"Understand that the article was about one thing—public tax dollars for private and parochial schools," Geiger said.

Added Lou Battaglieri, president of Local 1 MEA/NEA, Macomb: "In California, they got thumped in the ballot box."

Bicycle helmet law proposed Renters left out, advocate says

Small children would need helmets while riding on a bike or as passengers under a bill passed by the state House of Representatives.

Opponents called it "Big Brother" legislation, after the George Orwell novel 1984.

Sponsored by Rep. David Gubow, D-Huntington Woods, the bill says, "A person less than four years of age riding on a bicycle or as a passenger on a carrier or trailer attached to a bicycle shall

wear a helmet properly fastened on his or her head."

The House softened the bill by making it inapplicable in private driveways or private property not used for vehicular travel by the public.

The vote was 58 to 39. Observer area lawmakers supporting it were: Lyn Banks, R-Redford, Justin Barnes, D-Westland, William Keith, D-Garden City, and Richard Young, D-

Dearborn Heights.

Opposed were Jan Dolan, R-Farmington Hills, Jerry Vorva, R-Plymouth, and Deborah Whyman, R-Canton.

Whyman lodged an official protest in the House Journal: "We can't legislate EVERYTHING."

Refer to House Bill 4953 when writing to your senator. State Capitol, Lansing 48913. The bill is in the Senate Transportation Committee.

Renter-occupied housing is taxed as commercial property and may not benefit from proposed property tax cuts, a spokesman for the apartment industry says.

"Renters are being penalized because they don't own the home where they live," said Melvin Kaftan, president of the Apartment Association of Michigan (AAM) and of Kaftan Enterprises in Southfield. "Renters need to urge their state senators to include them

in the property tax rollback."

The 1990 Census indicated that 991,688 (or 29 percent) of housing units in Michigan were renter-occupied. They are classified as commercial property and are treated as businesses in paying taxes.

"Renters who can't afford to buy a home are at a disadvantage over people who already own homes," added Kaftan. "Renters will continue to pay property taxes plus any new taxes to fund education. It is important to find new approaches for funding Michigan's school systems but the benefit of the property tax cut should be for residences whether they are rental or owner-occupied."

The Legislature in July abolished property taxes for school operations, cutting more than \$6 billion in school district revenue. The House last week approved bills restoring 20 mills of property tax for commercial, industrial and second-home construction and 16 mills for primary residences. If voters next year raise the sales tax two cents, the Legislature would wipe out residential property taxes but not commercial-industrial.

Of all the renter-occupied units, 22 percent were occupied by "empty nesters" or seniors 55 years and over; 35 percent were occupied by three or more persons.

In a study published in the English medical journal, *The Lancet*, researchers put 96 healthy elderly volunteers into one of two groups. One group received placebos, while the other got multivitamin and mineral supplements for one year. The supplements contained vitamin and mineral amounts roughly comparable to U.S. RDA's (recommended dietary allowances). The only exceptions were vitamin E and beta-carotene, which were given in doses about four times the usual intake. In the end, the supplementation group only experienced 23 days with infection-related illnesses versus 48 sick days for the placebo group.

We know as we start that somebody will turn up who isn't on our lists.

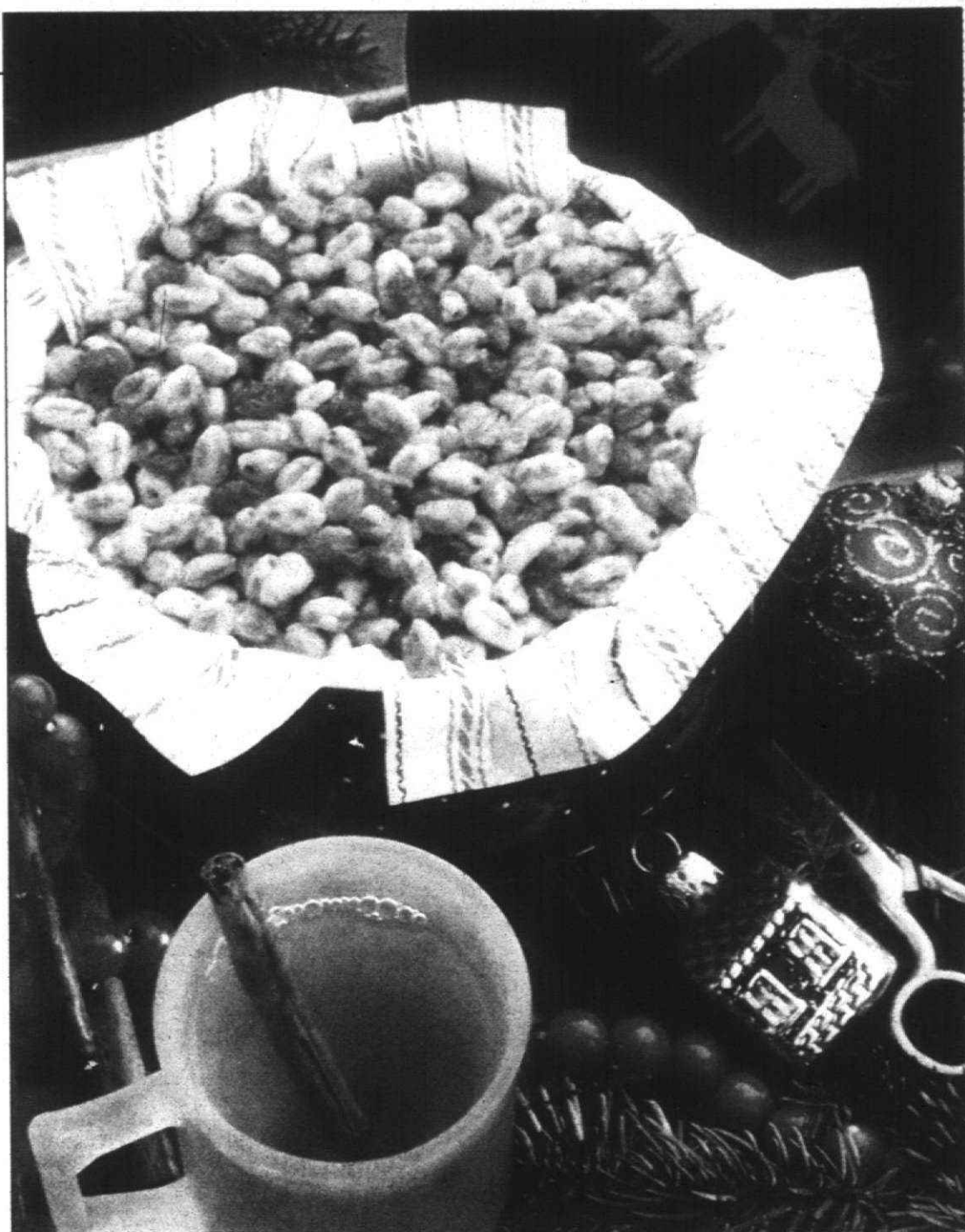

You don't have to worry about storing it after it's open - it's gone almost as soon as you open the jar."

Gall also makes chili sauce and salsa in the summertime, when fresh tomatoes are available, and freezes them for her family and for gifts.

malade in a few minutes, literally," said Bailey. "I keep an eye out for interesting small containers throughout the year. Nothing fancy or expensive - it could be a mug, or a jar that came with another product. One of my favorites is a graceful round jar that orange honey comes in."

"The kiwi-lime marmalade is different, something you'd never find in a store, and the dried cherry chutney is a good substitute for cranberry sauce. It's especially appropriate this year, because of the shortage of fresh cranberries for Christmas dinner."

California brandies gain international status

In California, only Alambic Inc. (more commonly known as Germain-Robin), Carneros Alambic and Jepson make small quantities of hand-

crafted, doubly-distilled grape brandies in the tradition of cognac. While these three premium pot-distilled brandy makers are not in a marketing league with the "big four" cognac houses - Courvoisier, Hennessy, Marten and Remy Martin, they have elevated their craft to an internationally recognized status. Astute brandy drinkers have learned about the artisan California pot-distilled brandy producers principally by word of mouth, but the word is out and spreading fast.

Brandy is a generic term for a wood-aged spirit obtained from the distillation of wine or a fermented fruit mash. An alcoholic beverage answering this description may be produced in any part of the world. California grape brandy has been produced for over 200 years, interrupted only by Prohibition, and boasts over 200 producers.

Most California grape brandy makers use a continuous still and age in American oak, a large percentage of which are once-used, heavily charred, Bourbon barrels. The artisan producers use an Alambic pot-still and follow cognac production techniques. California brandies are distilled from the

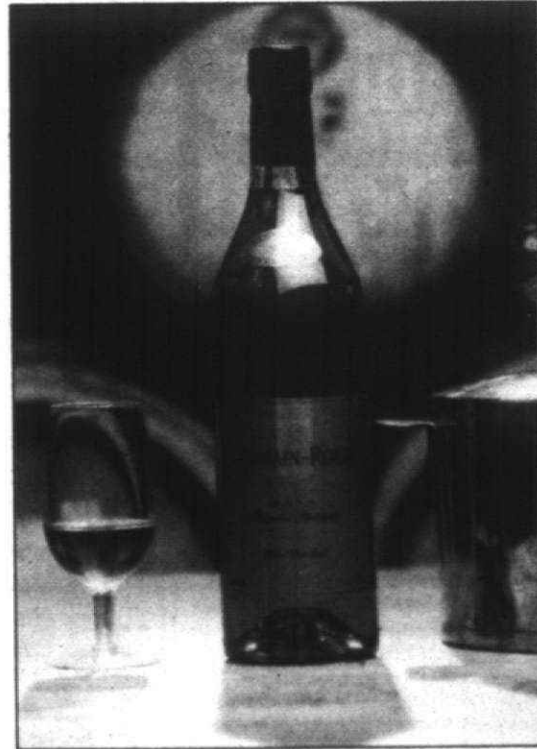
wine of several grape varieties, such as French colombar, pinot noir, gamay beaujolais, folle blanche, chenin blanc, muscat canelli and palomino. In Cognac, the ugni blanc grape is used.

"My partner Hubert Germain-Robin brought an antique cognac still to my Mendocino County ranch," explains Ansley J. Coale Jr., president of Alambic Inc. "Each year he hand-distills 80 barrels of a cognac-style brandy bearing his name. Germain-Robin, whose family has produced Jules Robin cognac since 1782, uses traditional methods which have been abandoned in France as uneconomical. The result is a true connoisseur's brandy, equal to cognacs from the best small houses."

"Hubert makes every drop the way a distiller in Cognac would have made his 'Paradise' in 1890. By making brandy in California, we have significant advantages (over Cognac): no rain (at harvest), so our grapes have no rot; early harvest in a sunny climate, which means good flavor and high acidity; much use of non-traditional varietals, which adds complexity; modern California winemaking and storage equipment, yielding exceptionally clean wines of delicacy and finesse. All cellaring is in the finest Limousin barrels."

Located in the Carneros District of southern Napa Valley, Carneros Alambic produces RMS Special Reserve, a California brandy produced in the cognac method. The distillery, built in 1984, houses eight specially hand-crafted and hand-assembled copper potstills manufactured in Cognac.

Carneros Alambic brandies are aged in 3700, 90-gallon Limousin oak barrels ranging in age from new to eight years old. "Instead of using one grape

MICROWAVE KIW LIME MARMALADE

4 kiwis, peeled, trimmed, and quartered lengthwise
zest of 1 lime, slivered
¼ cup sugar
2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
Cut the kiwi quarters into ¼-inch cubes. Combine kiwi cubes with lime zest and juice, and sugar. Place ingredients in a deep 2½-quart microwave-safe dish, and stir well.
Cook, uncovered, at full power for 5 minutes. Stir, return to the microwave, and cook until thick, about another 6 minutes.
Allow the marmalade to cool to room temperature, then place in a pretty container with a cover. Top with a seasonal bow or ornament. Marmalade will keep one week in the refrigerator. Makes 1 cup.

DRIED CHERRY CHUTNEY

2 cups dried pitted cherries
¼ cup sugar
¼ cup white vinegar
¼ cup finely chopped celery
¼ cup minced fresh ginger
6 tablespoons apple juice
3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
½ teaspoon crushed dried red pepper flakes (optional)
Combine all the ingredients in a microwave-safe, 2-quart dish, and stir well. Cook, uncovered, at full power for 6 minutes. Stir, making sure the sugar has dissolved, and return to the microwave. Cook another 8 minutes.
Allow the chutney to cool to room

temperature. Place in attractive containers, cover tightly, and refrigerate. It will keep for one week in the refrigerator. Makes 2 cups.

CAROLINE GALL'S CRANBERRY WINE JELLY

3 cups cranberry juice cocktail
7 cups sugar
¼ teaspoon cinnamon
¼ teaspoon ground cloves
1 cup port wine
1 bottle liquid fruit pectin
Combine juice, sugar and pieces, and mix well. Stir over high heat until sugar is dissolved. Bring to a full, rolling boil over high heat and boil hard for 1 minute, stirring constantly. (Note: Make sure you use a large enough pot — if it boils over it makes a terrible mess.)
Remove from heat — stir in wine and liquid pectin. Skim off foam with a metal spoon, and pour at once into hot jelly jars. Cover immediately with a thin layer of paraffin. Cool, cover jar, and store in refrigerator. (Makes 8 cups)

LEMON-SCENTED POUND CAKE

2 cups sugar
1 cup butter or margarine, room temperature
2 tablespoons lemon juice
2 teaspoons finely grated lemon rind
1 teaspoon vanilla
5 eggs
2 cups flour
Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In large bowl of electric mixer, cream together sugar and butter until light and fluffy. Beat in lemon juice, lemon rind, and vanilla.

MOMMA'S KIFLS

Cookie:
2 eight-ounce packages cream cheese, softened
1 pound butter or margarine, at room temperature
4 cups sifted flour
¼ cup powdered sugar
Filling:
1 cup finely ground nuts (walnuts, almonds, etc.)
1 teaspoon fresh grated lemon rind
1-3 tablespoons of milk
Cream together the cream cheese with the butter or margarine. Beat until fluffy. Stir in flour and mix with a fork until blended and mixture clings together.
Make individual balls about the size of a small walnut and chill balls in refrigerator for 2 hours. Roll out individual cookie balls in powdered sugar approximately 5-6 inches in diameter. (The size of a small plate).
In a small bowl, combine nuts with lemon rind and just enough

milk to make the nuts and rind hold together. Place a small amount of filling lengthwise in rolled cookie and carefully roll and shape into crescents.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Place kifls on a greased cookie sheet and bake for 10-12 minutes or until very lightly golden. Cool on cookie racks. Sprinkle with more powdered sugar, if desired. Store in airtight containers. Makes about 8-9 dozen, depending on the size.

MOMMA'S FAVORITE CRESCENT COOKIES

¾ cup almonds, blanched and sliced
½ cup vanilla sugar (To make granulated sugar, put 1 pound vanilla bean and bury it in the sugar. Cover the jar tightly and store at a cool room temperature for 7 to 10 days before using.)
¾ cup unsalted butter, room temperature
½ cup shortening (butter flavored, if available)

■ The batter should be frozen in the pan in which it will be baked. To free up your pans, first line them with heavy-duty foil, then pour in the batter and freeze it, uncovered, until it is solid. This usually takes 6 to 12 hours. Remove the batter from the pan and wrap it completely in heavy duty foil, label and date the package, and return to the freezer.

■ To bake, grease the baking pan in which the batter was frozen, peel away the foil, and place the batter back in the pan.

■ "The quality of baked goods is far superior when you freeze batters rather than the finished product," said Bailey. "The only adjustment you must make is the

baking time — depending on the batter's density and the size of the baking dish, you will need to increase the bake time by 5 to 30 minutes."

■ Most batters will keep up to four weeks at 0 F. If your freezer doesn't maintain that temperature, keep the batter frozen no more than two weeks.

varieties and blend the brandies to achieve our style," explains-Carneros Alambic's director Bernard La Borie. "Ugni blanc, grown in California, does not give us the fruity character we desire. We want ripe flavors from mature grapes, but they must be balanced against the higher alcohol of the spirit."

Located in a cool growing area along the Russian River in Mendocino County, Jepson grows French colombar in a 47-year-old vineyard and distills the only single vineyard, estate-bottled brandy in California. Brandy Master Kurt Lorenzi thinks brandy enthusiasts are fortunate since colombar grows particularly well at Jepson's Mendocino County vineyard. The grape thrives in rocky riverbed soils where warm daytime temperatures are moderated by afternoon breezes and cool nights.

Estate grapes are hand harvested and fermented into small lots of wine. The best of these are hand distilled in the winery's

Alambic potstill brought from France in 1983. The doubly distilled brandy is then aged in French Limousin oak for five to six years. Lorenzi notes that his brandy retains the flavor of the fruit and the warmth of the sun. After spending the requisite time in barrel, Lorenzi critically

re-evaluates each barrel and blends what may be described as a best-lots selection boasting fresh fruit and a soft, round mouthfeel.

overtones finish with vanilla-warm accents.

■ Germain-Robin Fine Alambic Brandy Lot No. 8 (\$35) is amber-gold with aromas of pear, banana, apricot, oak and vanilla cream. The flavors mirror the best of the nose with a smooth, delicate presence and truity aftertaste.

■ Germain-Robin Reserve (\$50) has a copper color and aromas of vanilla, caramel, toffee and wood followed by intense woody notes on the palate and finish.

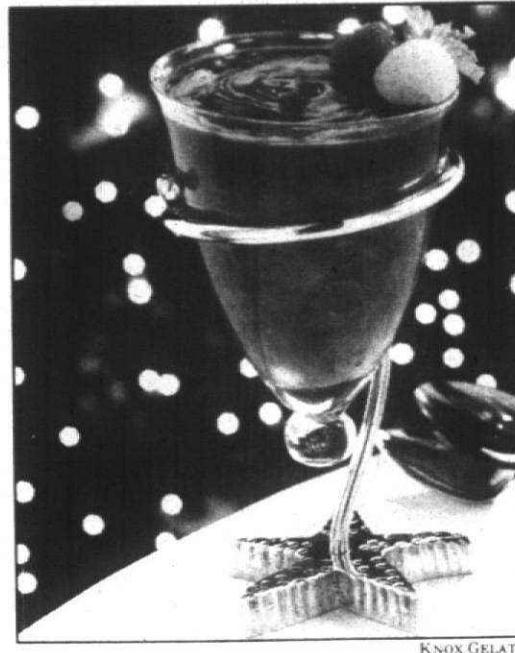

2 tablespoons unsalted butter
In 3-quart saucepan, bring 2 cups water, cranberries, cranberry juice, and ¾ cup sugar to a boil, stirring occasionally. Continue boiling 10 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Add strawberries; continue boiling an additional 5 minutes. Add raspberries; remove from heat.

Meanwhile, in large bowl, sprinkle unflavored gelatin over remaining 1 cup water; let stand 5 minutes. Add hot fruit mixture to gelatin, stirring until gelatin is completely dissolved. Pour mixture into 8 dessert dishes; chill until firm, about 2 hours.

Place chocolate in large stainless steel bowl; set aside. In 3-quart saucepan, combine cream, butter, and remaining 2 tablespoons sugar. Stir over medium-high heat until sugar is dissolved. Bring mixture to a boil, then pour over chocolate; let stand 5 minutes. Stir until smooth; cool to room temperature. Evenly pour chocolate over fruit mixture in dishes; chill until ready to serve. Garnish, if desired, with strawberries and raspberries. Serves 8.

Turn baked potatoes into party nibbles

AP — Low-fat sour cream and nonfat yogurt turn new baked potatoes into a healthful party nibble — and you can bake them in your microwave oven. Parmesan cheese and fresh dill give them full, fresh flavor. Cook the miniature potato skins ahead of time, then reheat and fill before your guests arrive.

POTATOES WITH DILL-SOUR CREAM

1 pound whole tiny new potatoes (10 to 12)
3 tablespoons low-fat sour cream

2 tablespoons nonfat plain yogurt
2 tablespoons finely chopped green onion
2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
1 teaspoon snipped fresh dill or ¼ teaspoon dried dillweed
Dash pepper
Lemon slices (optional)
Fresh dill (optional)

Scrub potatoes with a vegetable brush. Use a fork to prick the skins. Arrange potatoes on a microwave-safe plate. Cook, uncovered, for 7 to 9 minutes on 100 percent power (high) or until potatoes test done with a fork, turning potatoes over and rearranging halfway through the cooking time. Remove from oven; cool until potatoes are easy to handle.

Cut potatoes in half and place, cut side up, on the same microwave-safe plate. With a small melon-ball scoop, remove some of the top from each potato to make room for filling. Reserve centers for another use. (At this point, cover potatoes and refrigerate until serving time or for up to 24 hours.)

To reheat, on a microwave-safe plate, cook potatoes, covered with vented plastic wrap, for 2 to 3 minutes on high or until heated through.

Meanwhile, in a small mixing bowl combine sour cream and yogurt. Place 2 teaspoons of the yogurt mixture in each potato. Sprinkle each potato with green onion, cheese, dill and pepper. If desired, garnish with lemon slices and fresh dill. Makes 20 to 24 servings.

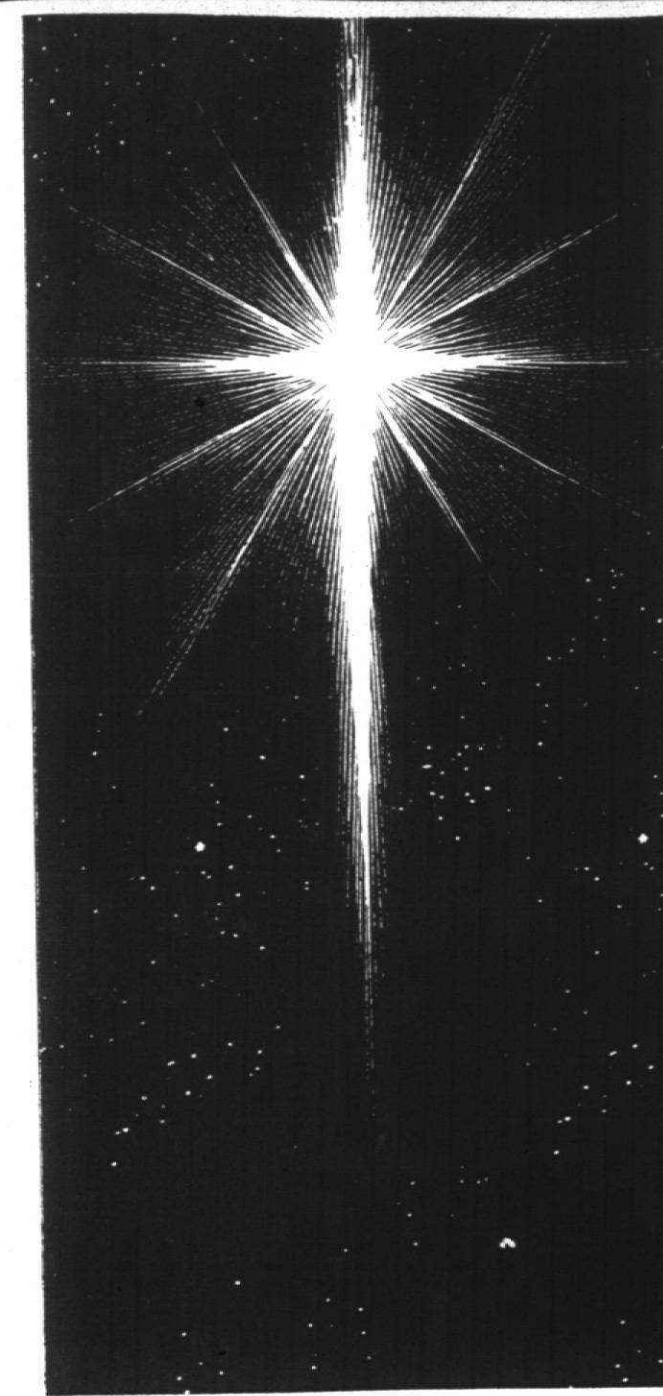

Being smacked by a car led him to Easter Seals

The terrifying experience of being hit by a car at the age of 6 is something that stays with you for a lifetime. For Cary Storch, attorney and chairman of the board of the Easter Seal Society of Southeastern Michigan, that experience was the catalyst that brought him to Easter Seals more than 10 years ago.

"I was hit by a car when I was 6 years old. After spending three months in a body cast, I wasn't able to walk, so I started school at the Oakman School for Crippled Children in Detroit," Storch said. "That experience has stayed with me all of my life because I was one of the lucky ones. I walked out of the Oakman School on my own, but some of those kids never left."

Because of his childhood experience, Storch has always been interested in helping the handicapped. "I just called Easter Seals one day, told them I was interested in doing something to help," Storch said. "I joined the board of directors in the mid-1970s and just started working to raise money to provide services for Easter Seals' clients. Ever since then I've been hooked."

Involvement with Easter Seals became a family affair in the Storch household. "I used to bring my kids to Easter Seal events when they were little. It was the best thing in the world for them because they got to meet people with disabilities and see them as just regular people," Storch said.

"You know how uninhibited kids can be. When my son saw a person riding in an electric wheelchair, he thought it looked like great fun, so he asked for a ride. My son saw a person in a wheelchair. He did not see a disabled person. I learned a lot from my

son that day," Storch said. Storch also has been a VIP on the annual Easter Seal Telethon on WDIV-TV, raising many thousands of dollars over the years, and served as the president of the board of directors of the Easter Seal Society of Oakland County from 1982 to 1989. After a brief absence from the board, as required in the by-laws, he was re-elected in 1991.

With the completion of the merger of the Easter Seal societies in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties, Storch was elected chairman of the board. "I am really excited about Easter Seals, especially the opportunities open to us since the merger for growth and expansion," Storch said. "I hope I can be a catalyst for the board and for all of the good people who work for this society."

Storch points out that everyone is vulnerable to becoming disabled. In fact, statistics show that in every 11 people will become disabled at sometime during their lives.

"I get a lot of personal satisfaction out of volunteering for Easter Seals because I know that Easter Seals helps people with all types of disabilities," he said. "So I know that my work is doing some good for somebody in need. I don't need to be given credit for my efforts. The people that are helped by Easter Seals are the real heroes, because they never give up. If they don't quit, how could I?"

The mission of Easter Seals is to promote the maximum independence of people with disabilities by developing and providing quality services.

Get out fast in a house fire

Studies indicate that once a fire has started in the home, a person has about three minutes to escape the overwhelming effects of smoke, poisonous gases or superheated air, according to AAA Michigan.

On such short notice, residents of a household need to be prepared and even rehearsed to act fast in this terrifying situation.

Some areas deserve special attention. Smoke detectors are the best protection in a home fire. Many victims suffer upstairs from bedrooms. Smoke detectors can prevent such deaths.

The most dangerous period for fatalities from fires is between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. Alarms sound prior to a spreading fire, allowing residents to escape before being overcome by smoke and gases. "Location is key," according to AAA Michigan Community Safety Services Manager Jerry Busch. "Bedrooms need the most protection. A detector should be placed outside each bedroom in the hallway. If the hallway is longer than 30 feet, alarms should be installed at each end."

Also, he advises that detectors should be kept away from a fireplace, wood stove or cooking fumes to avoid false alarms.

Install the devices six inches away from dead air spaces near walls and corners. Do not place them closer than three feet from an air register that might recirculate smoke. Do not place on uninsulated exterior walls or ceilings. Temperature extremes can affect batteries. Maintenance of the alarm is essential for early detection. Devices should be checked every 30 days and batteries replaced every year or as needed. If you have been away from home any length of time, detectors should be checked upon returning.

Fire extinguishers should be kept at a readily

available location. Locate these devices near the doors of rooms with potential fire sources (furnace-stove). Keep one on each level of the dwelling and one in the garage.

Proper operation is very important because extinguisher contents empty fast. Aim at the base of the fire and sweep from side to side, standing six to eight feet from the blaze.

It is critical that the proper extinguisher be used. Not only might the fire not be extinguished, but the flames could increase.

Since youngsters under age 12 account for more than 20 percent of Michigan's fire casualties annually, extra precautions for them, as well as for the elderly and handicapped should be taken. Practice drills should be supervised by an adult. Emphasize the importance of children escaping on their own and the danger of trying to hide from the fire. Stress getting out fast and staying out.

Arrange for infants and children to sleep in a bedroom next to parents. Teach children to stop, drop and roll and cover face with hands if clothes catch fire.

For elderly residents, make sleeping arrangements on a ground floor, if possible. Install a smoke detector and telephone in or near the bedroom.

"Special precautions should be taken for physically or mentally challenged occupants," Busch emphasized. Whistles and visual signaling systems can aid in evacuation. A specially designed escape route may be necessary.

Feel the door with the back of the hand. If it's hot, do not open it. If there is heat and smoke, seal off cracks around doors and vents with cloth or rugs, soaked in water, if possible.

Social Security benefits rising 2.6 percent in 1994

Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) beneficiaries will get a 2.6 percent increase in payments beginning Jan. 1.

The average Social Security benefit for retired workers will rise from \$657 to \$674 monthly. The maximum benefit for retired workers will increase to \$1,147 from \$1,128 monthly.

The maximum federal SSI monthly payments to individuals will rise to \$446 from \$434. The

State of Michigan supplements this amount.

The employee (withholding) tax rate stays the same at 7.65 percent as does the self-employed rate at 15.30 percent.

"All changes are legislated at the federal level," said Marilyn Alimovich, field representative of the northwest Detroit office, in Redford Township. "It (payments) goes up every year. Last year it was 3 or 3.2 percent."

Payments are based on the Consumer Price Index put forth by the Department of Labor.

The 7.65 percent represents the combined Social Security and Medicare tax rate. The Social Security portion (Old Age Survivor and Disability Insurance or OAS-DI) is 6.20 percent on wages up to the applicable maximum taxable amount.

The Medicare portion (Health Insurance or HI) is 1.45 percent on all wages for 1994.

Maximum earnings taxable on Social Security (OASDI) will rise to \$60,600 from \$57,600.

Retirement Earnings Test Exempt Amounts (gross earnings)

for people ages 65-89 rise from \$10,560/year (\$880 per month) to \$11,160 year (\$930 per month). For those under age 65, the amount rises from \$7,680/year (\$640/month) to \$8,040/year (\$670/month).

"For people age 65 through age 69, \$1 in benefits will be withheld for every \$3 in earnings above the limit," Alimovich said. "For people under age 65, \$1 will be withheld for every \$2 in earnings above the limit."

The maximum Social Security

benefit for a worker retiring at age 65 in January of 1993 and 1994, will now be \$1,147/month, up from \$1,128/month.

The SSI Federal Payment Standard for an individual rises from \$434 month to \$446/month. For a couple, the amount will rise from \$652/month to \$669/month.

The average monthly Social Security benefits before and after the December 1993 cost of living allowance are as follows: All retired workers will receive \$674 up from \$657; for an aged couple with both receiving benefits, the

amount rises from \$1,111 to \$1,140. Benefits for a widowed mother and two children will increase from \$1,282 to \$1,316. For an aged widow who lives alone, the amount will be \$631, an increase from \$615 to \$631.

For a disabled worker, spouse and one or more children, the amount rises from \$1,064 to \$1,092. For all disabled workers, the amount increases to \$641.

He'll finally take that overdue break when he heads west to watch the Badgers and his son Lee, a senior middle guard, tackle UCLA in Pasadena.

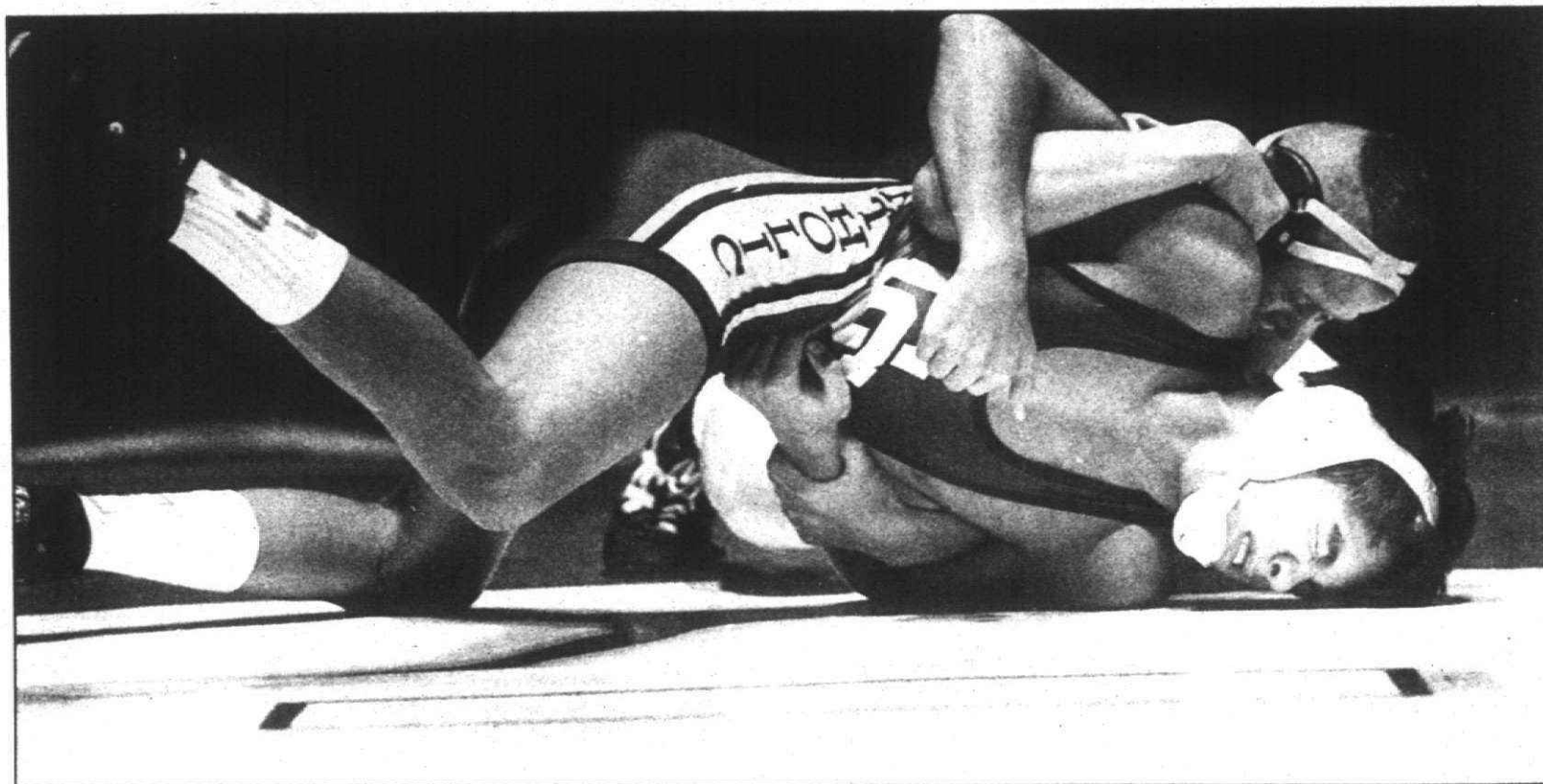
"I haven't been on a vacation since my honeymoon," said Krueger. He'll celebrate his silver anniversary (that's 25 years) in the very near future.

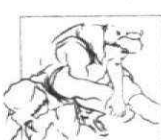
"All his friends are wishing he was home on vacation but he's glad he's still up there," the elder Krueger said. "We just got off the phone with him. He's in another world right now."

Salem stuns Catholic Central

A good indicator of what kind of dual-meet opener it was for both Redford Catholic Central's and Plymouth Salem's wrestling teams might be found in counting how many matches each team won. The Rocks did rule the scoreboard, but illness hurt both teams.

It cannot be denied them. Plymouth Salem's Rocks were the better team Thursday when they battled, and beat, an always-tough Redford Catholic Central contingent 41-30 at Salem.

But if the two met again in the season's final week, the results could be vastly different. Perhaps the score would change just a few points, but there could be radical changes in individual matches.

Two teams with such solid programs never have three matches de-

cided by voids without a reason. There was one: illness. Substitutes were forced into action; wrestlers were forced to move up to heavier divisions; lineups were scrambled.

"They didn't have a lot of their kids in their lineup," admitted Salem coach Ron Krueger. "But we were without a few, too."

Indeed the Rocks were. They were forced to void both the 103-pound division and heavyweight due to illness. CC had one vacancy, at 160.

But as Krueger pointed out: "The ones that did wrestle, did wrestle."

True enough. Of the 10 matches actually wrestled, Salem won seven.

No better example of Salem's overall performance could be found than at 152 pounds, where sophomore Jeremy Breithaupt outdueled CC's Liam O'Donahue 11-10. Upon cursory examination, this pairing seemed a mismatch. O'Donahue was a regional qualifier last season and is the Shamrocks' captain this season.

Breithaupt is just a sophomore.

Freshman emerges heroic in thrilling Madonna win

There are points in a season that define a team, a game here and there that you can look back on and say, that's the night we pulled together and became a unit; or, that's the night we began to break apart.

Friday night's 79-75 victory against Indiana Wesleyan provided that kind of benchmark for the Madonna University women's basketball team.

The Lady Crusaders appeared ripe for a fracture. They have come staggering out of the gate with a 3-5 record and started listlessly against a strong Indiana Wesleyan team that brought an 11-3 record to Livonia Friday.

"We just didn't have the intensity that we should have had," Coach Bill Potter said.

Bannon down, team up

Something else was missing, too. Shawn Bannon. She picked up two quick fouls and was on the bench for all but nine minutes of the first half.

Now, understand the severity of this. Bannon, the Livonia native and former Miss Basketball runner-up from Dearborn Divine Child, came to Madonna after starting for two seasons at Division I Central Michigan. This is the person who, by the time she leaves Madonna, will rewrite the record books for scoring, shooting percentage, assists and steals. She's averaging 18 points, four as-

sists and four steals per game.

"She runs the show for us," is how Potter put it.

And there she was, rooted on the bench. And there was Madonna, watching Wesleyan drain three 3-pointers in the first eight minutes, falling behind by as many eight points.

"We look to Shawn to lead the team," said senior co-captain Jill Burt. "When she's in there, she takes charge of the game. She controls the tempo. But I think we showed tonight that we don't depend only on her. We are definitely a team."

It was Burt, who is only 5-7 but plays inside with the power of a 6-footer, and junior Stephanie Crelley who helped Madonna fight its way back into the game. Burt tallied eight points and Crelley six to cut Wesleyan's lead to three, 37-34, at the half.

"We just pulled each other up," Burt said. "We wouldn't allow ourselves to get down."

Bannon's burst

The Crusaders fell behind by as many as seven early in the second half as well. That's when Bannon flashed her Division I skills. In a span of about seven minutes, she scored seven points, set up three other baskets with pin-point passes, made a steal and forced two other turnovers.

Her basket with 10:44 left gave Madonna its first lead since the first minute of the game, 54-53, and set up a frenetic finish that featured four ties in the final four minutes.

"I'm struggling with my shot right now," Bannon said. "And when you aren't hitting your shots, you just have to find some other way to help the team. You can't win if you're just a one-person team and we showed we aren't a one-person team."

Hero emerges

Bannon air-balled a 3-point attempt and missed a layup late in the game. Instead of setting off a panic, it seemed to bond the

team. And up stepped freshman Meegan Marlatt.

Marlatt hit a triple to cut Wesleyan's lead to two, 67-65, with 5:15 left. She knocked down another triple with 3:06 left to tie the game at 71. Then she banged home a running three-footer on the next possession to put the team up 73-71.

Then, after Burt executed a three-point play with 45 seconds left to put Madonna ahead 78-75, Marlatt locked up the victory with a free throw.

"We weren't together early in the year," Marlatt said. "We were sort of struggling with each other. But now we're definitely together. This was a big win for us."

Burt finished with 19 points, five rebounds and five assists. Marlatt had 15 points. Crelley had 12 points and Denise Williams scored 10. Cathy Morris led Wesleyan with 21 points, 12 on 3-point shots.

Bannon finished with eight points on 3-for-13 shooting, seven assists and six rebounds. Not exactly Division I stats, but was she complaining?

"It's been a hard adjustment for both me and for the other girls, but, really, I have no regrets," she said. "I still miss the (Division I) competition and sometimes here I forget some of the things that I learned playing Division I. But the biggest thing is that I've re-focused myself. I'm here because I want to be a nurse and to have fun playing basketball. This is the first time I've had fun playing since I left high school."

A defining moment for Bannon and for the Crusaders.

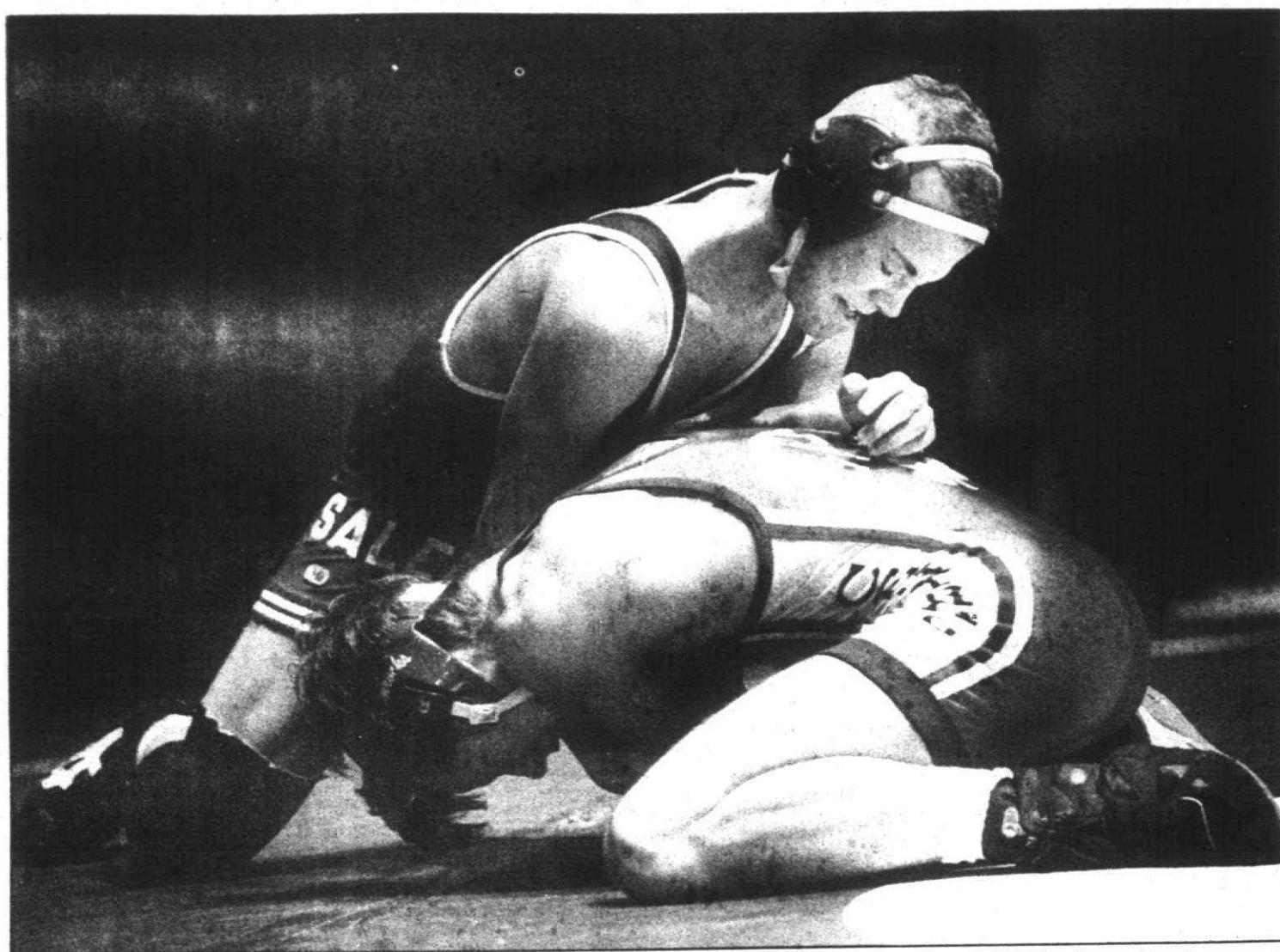

That started a string of four consecutive match victories for the Rocks. Scott Hughes defeated David Garcia 12-2 at 125; Aaron Lapinski outscored Tom Derhake 14-6 at 130; and Phil Mitchell pinned Greg Alcila in 3:18 at 135, after Mitchell had missed workouts all week due to illness.

The Shamrocks, who won got a win at 103 from Dario Ianni (on a void) and at 112 from Bill Lamb (a pin of Greg Mitchell in 1:05) to start the meet, ended Salem's streak with Mike Cretu's pin of

Joe Stiver in 3:48 at 140.

The comedy album has become a sort of lost art, in this age of 24-hour comedy cable TV channels and an abundance of clubs providing the live stuff to willing audiences. Gone are the days of the scratchy (from overplaying) Bill Cosby, Robert Klein and Bob Newhart long-play vinyl records. Despite the fact that compact discs and cassette tapes have replaced vinyl (and provided a higher quality, longer lasting format for listening to comedy), you don't find many stand-up performers releasing their material for the masses to just take a listen.

Skanking to a Midwestern beat

■ In the shadow of ska scene founders from the East and West coasts, Midwestern bands are often overlooked. With the release of "American Ska-Thic," its organizers and contributors hope that will change.

If the Detroit-based ska band The Exceptions had their way, the ska spotlight would shine upon the Midwest.

Many of the first U.S. ska bands like Fishbone and Bim Skala Bim came out of the East or West coasts. By natural selection, therefore, the Midwestern scene has been largely ignored.

"It's just the way things are," The Exceptions guitarist Ryan Reeves said matter-of-factly. "The first (ska) bands came from Boston (such as) Bim Skala Bim. The Toasters are from New York, and these guys started it in 1986. Fishbone from California. With bands like these paving the way, many people think it's only the East and West coasts."

STREET BEATS

Things may change now that Jump Up Records in Chicago has released "American Ska-Thic: A Portrait of Midwest Ska Past and Present" with distribution help from Moon and Cargo records. The Exceptions, who contributed the single "I Hate Mornings," will host and headline a record release party for the compilation on Monday, Dec. 27, at St. Andrew's Hall in Detroit.

The party will also include performances from Livonia-based The Skolars ("Rude Girl") and Grand Rapids' Mustard Plug ("Grow Up"). The CD contains singles from 18 other Midwest bands including several from the Detroit area such as the Parka Kings ("Jacked") and the now-defunct J.K. Kevorkian and the Suicide Machines ("Hey"). The bands on the CD and scheduled to perform at the show share an element often missing in a lot of current music, according to compilation organizer Chuck Wren. "It's real live music," said Wren, who hosts a ska radio show on WNUF at Northwestern University in Chicago. "We went through a trend that went through a very pressed-out musical (style), but ska is live. There are so many bands in the Midwest that keep getting overlooked and I'm sick of it."

According to Gangster Fun's drummer Brian Bowie, compared to its predecessors, Midwestern ska is in its infant stages. It will be recognized more as it matures.

"The Midwestern ska scene is very young when you compare it with New York and San Francisco Bay area a lot of ska bands are young and really don't have it together," he said. "I don't think Mid-

western ska is that good due to the freshness of it."

Ska in general, however, is an often overlooked musical style making it unfamiliar to many people. Ska is Jamaica's first independent musical export, according to Wren. Upon its creation in the 1960s, it absorbed elements of West Indies calypso and American jazz. During the 1980s, English bands such as Madness and The Stranglers added more energy to the beat and popularized the style.

Today's ska sounds incorporate a variety of influences from Fishbone's funk beats to the rock sound of the Mighty Mighty Bosstones, Wren said.

What separates ska from reggae is "it's faster and more energetic. Reggae is more of a ska on hallucinogens," explained The Exceptions' trombonist Jim Hofer.

When Wally sings, people listen

Commanding the attention of noisy patrons in a college bar isn't an easy task — especially by a fresh-faced man strapping with an acoustic guitar.

But when Wally Pleasant starts singing his "humorous songs with a message" it's almost like E.F. Hutton is talking — everybody listens.

He piques a chuckle out of fraternity guys and sorority girls when he sings "I Was a Teenage Republican."

Most women aren't offended when he tells one of his tales of woe "She's Addicted to Clothes."

The soft-spoken Pleasant even carries over his sly sense of humor into his off-stage life. When the waiters at an area restaurant walk through the restaurant singing "Hap-

py Birthday," he looks up and says slyly, "I told them it was your birthday."

Not really, but that's the playful spirit of Wally Pleasant.

Sometimes people take his character too seriously. For example, a woman who was interviewing Pleasant once asked him to answer questions in a "Spinal Tap" fashion. She wanted him to act clueless and push records that didn't even exist, he said, rolling his eyes and smiling.

Pleasant, a graduate of Birmingham Groves High School and Michigan State University, isn't all about humor, however. Some of his "radio friendly" songs — as he calls them — like "I Hate Cops" may have his trademark schtick, but the words are biting, so much so that it's almost funny.

"It's good to have a certain amount (of humor). I use humor to get people's attention," said Pleasant who now lives in St. Johns, north of Lansing.

Pleasant, who's often compared to Jonathan Richman, said he likes people to "go away with a smile" although many of his songs have messages.

"I don't try to give speeches, or divulge my deepest psychological feelings," Pleasant said.

"I try to be entertaining and I want to do records and live shows that people are entertained by. If that's a novelty, so be it."

True faith is examined in 'Saints'

She sits quietly on the side of her bed, asking for a miracle. "If I sit perfectly still for five minutes," she prays aloud to God, "then please make the message from the Virgin Mary one of peace."

This child-like belief never leaves Therese, one of the heroines in Nancy Savoca's new film "Household Saints." This uncompromising comedy about family and faith, set in New York's Little Italy, plays in a limited run at the AMC Abbey in Madison Heights.

The movie, which spans a 20-year period from roughly 1950 to 1970, begins when bachelor butcher Joseph Santangelo (Vincent D'Onofrio) wins his wife in a card game. The prospect isn't all that horrible for 17-year-old Catherine (Tracey Ullman), who has spent most of her life caring for a father and brother.

She moves into the Santangelo home with Joseph and his mother

(Judith Malina). According to the old lady, Catherine isn't pretty enough, doesn't cook well, and perpetuates a family curse. When Catherine becomes pregnant, Catherine's head swims with Old Country superstitions.

A first child is still-born while a second, Therese, grows up amidst the standard trappings of Catholic school and church. The difference is that while most of the girls are grabbing smokes in the bathroom and talking about boys, Therese thinks up new ways to serve God.

True inspiration comes when Therese learns about her St. Therese, "The Little Flower," whose ordinary life was filled with acts of faith. She will follow in the saint's footsteps and, once graduated from high school, will join the Carmelite Sisters.

Tracey Ullman, whose Fox

comedy show remains among the past decade's cleverest, still hasn't made the leap to movies well. She's too clownish in her early scenes as a 17-year-old but grows into motherhood well, sporting a classic Carol Brady hairdo from the early 1970s.

Lili Taylor, who plays teenage Therese, captures the bizarre, angelic quality that makes her character so fascinating. She's the kind of girl who never has a mean thought enter her head. Instead of turning away in disgust from her alcoholic uncle, she prays for him to seek the guidance he needs to become a better person.

Some of the subplots, especially the one about the uncle's obsession with Asian women, are too hokey not to have come from real life. You get the feeling that writer and co-director Savoca wasn't only listening carefully to the stories around her family dinner table, but taking elaborate notes.

It would have made good Hollywood sense for Savoca, who

received positive reviews for her previous "True Love" and "Dogfight," to deliver a popular movie. This would give her the clout to make subsequent projects her way.

What does she do instead? She makes a movie about religion, traditionally box office poison. Despite the financial and emotional backing of Academy Award-winner Jonathan Demme and solid word of mouth, the movie was abandoned by the Main Theatre in Royal Oak, where it might have brought out more of the casually curious.

It's precisely this uncompromising quality that makes Savoca a fascinating filmmaker and her "Household Saints" such a heart-felt and moving work.

World comes to Sesame Street for New Year's Eve

"Sesame Street" by any other name? That would be "Sesamstrasse" or "Sesam Stasjon" or "Plaza Sesamo" or even "Rechov Sumsum." And it seems there are as many ways to get to Sesame Street, the 25-year-old entertainment and education series for preschoolers, as there are ways to say it.

Viewers can stroll Around the Corner and around the world in PBS' prime-time special "Sesame Street Stays Up Late! A Monster New Year's Eve Party," airing a couple of days and a few hours early on Wednesday, Dec. 29 (check local listings). Like other evening editions of the series, which have celebrated Christmas Eve and taught millions to put down the duckie (if they wanted to play the saxophone), this is an hour of family viewing worthy of saving on tape for new years to come. The Wednesday air date makes it possible for parents with New Year's Eve plans to share the show with their children ahead of time.

The special makes generous use of the series' new Around the Corner set, an extension of the old storefronts and front stoops that adds a park, subway station, strictly-for-Muppets hotel and several new businesses to the milieu. The season's new faces - both Muppet and human - are visible, too. Viewers who haven't met Zoe or Baby Bear, or didn't know Ruth Buzzi now gets her laughs with kids, are in for some surprises.

It's unusual for "Sesame Street" to set a show after dark, but this is New Year's Eve. Several of the grown-up couples say goodbye and head out for the evening, but Gina (Alison Bartlett) and Savion (Savion Glover) stay behind to have a party with the kids. (Big Bird, after all, is still just 6).

While Telly worries, Snuffy takes a nap and the Count counts down the seconds until midnight, Elmo anchors a Monster News Network special report on New Year's traditions around the world. The first stop is Mexico, where Elmo's cousin, Pepe,

and the visiting Rosita (a bilingual "Sesame Street" regular) report on the making and breaking of a holiday pinata. Additional reports are filed from Norway (site of the next Olympic Games), Israel, Portugal, Germany and Japan. After each report, delivery man Grover brings Elmo a sample of good things from around the world, whether it's handmade New Year's cards from Japan or a giant doughnut that rolls in from Germany.

"We wanted to show what it's like to be a kid in another country celebrating New Year's Eve," says executive producer Nina Elias Bamberger. "(We wanted to show) the games they play, the songs they sing, the food they eat and the wishes they make. The universal theme we're trying to convey is children having fun, celebrating friendship and peace."

The program was months in the planning and includes characters from five foreign "Sesame Street" productions. The Israeli segment, taped during Jewish New Year in September, features Oofnik the Grouch and Kippy the Porcupine. Kippy, who exemplifies the Israeli image of being hard on the outside and soft on the inside, is that country's counterpart to Big Bird. Though Japan has no national edition of the show, its NHK network collaborated on the Japanese segment, which features the debut of correspondent Elmonoske, Elmo's cousin in Tokyo. Puppeteer Kevin Clash, who plays Elmo, flew to Japan and Mexico to tape segments for the special.

To J. Baxter's Urist, senior vice president of "Sesame Street" producer Children's Television Workshop, the special is a natural step in the series' quarter-century evolution. "From the beginning, the program was intended to show children different cultures, so it's always had an international flavor."

To Bamberger's way of thinking, that makes "Sesame Street Stays Up Late" "truly a one-world production."
