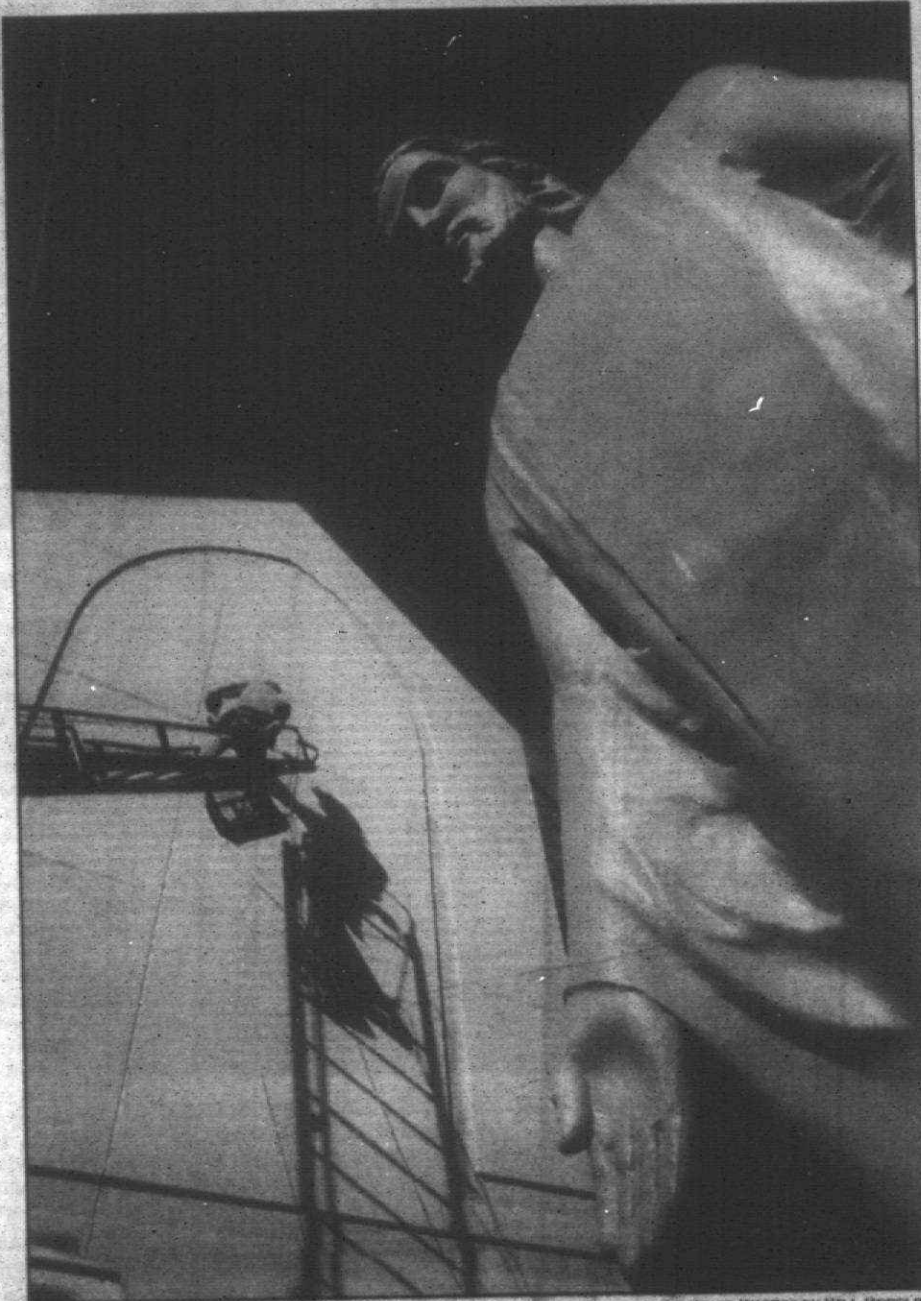

Sculpture reveals talents

Canton's Joseph DeLauro waited almost one year after completing his 12-foot Christ sculpture to see it in its rightful place — the front wall of Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church in Livonia.

Installed and dedicated two weeks ago, the commanding figure with arms outstretched now welcomes all through its doors.

"I don't think there's anything that

Roadway concerns weighed

■ The new chamber subcommittee addresses the task force's recommendation to establish a group to tackle retail and office concerns on Ford Road.

The Canton Chamber of Commerce is taking on the challenge of addressing a set of priorities recommended for Ford Road business uses.

"We really do not want this to sit," said Tom Adamusik, outgoing chamber president.

When the Ford Road Task Force report was released in October, chamber officials jumped on the issue and created a subcommittee to address retail-mix issues — one of four major issues studied for the thoroughfare.

"We knew it was coming," Adamusik said, adding that the subcommittee includes some members of the chamber's standing retail committee.

The Ford Road Task Force report includes priorities, time frames and financial strategies for accomplishing goals for aesthetic, retail and traffic improvements.

The new chamber subcommittee addresses the task force's recommendation to establish a group to tackle retail and office concerns on Ford Road. Other recommendations include improving the

marketability of Ford Road with an economic development plan and preparing a Ford Road identity for future promotions, including marketing packets and demographic information.

The task force also recommended that methods should be devised to tailor future developments to follow a theme created for the thoroughfare, such as working with banks to help businesses make low-cost improvements. Also suggested was creation and marketing of unusual retail and office developments, such as small office centers, village shopping, pedestrian access and clustered shopping areas set aside for parks.

The task force also recommended recruiting efforts to fill shopping gaps, such as vegetable-fruit markets, restaurants with outdoor seating, a major hotel with banquet facilities, an auto dealer, a bookstore, a furniture store and a newspaper office.

"We need to market Canton. That would be one goal," Adamusik said.

Meanwhile, a subcommittee of the Leadership Canton group will work on developing a theme for Canton. "That may go hand-in-hand with marketing Canton," Adamusik said.

Canton Supervisor Tom Yack said the chamber can lead the way in filling in the business and service gaps on Ford Road, as well as balancing the types of uses on the thoroughfare.

Healthy demographics have already drawn a number of businesses to Canton. The data will continue to be used, said Linda Shapona, chamber

The unit is being sponsored by Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan and Blue Care Network.

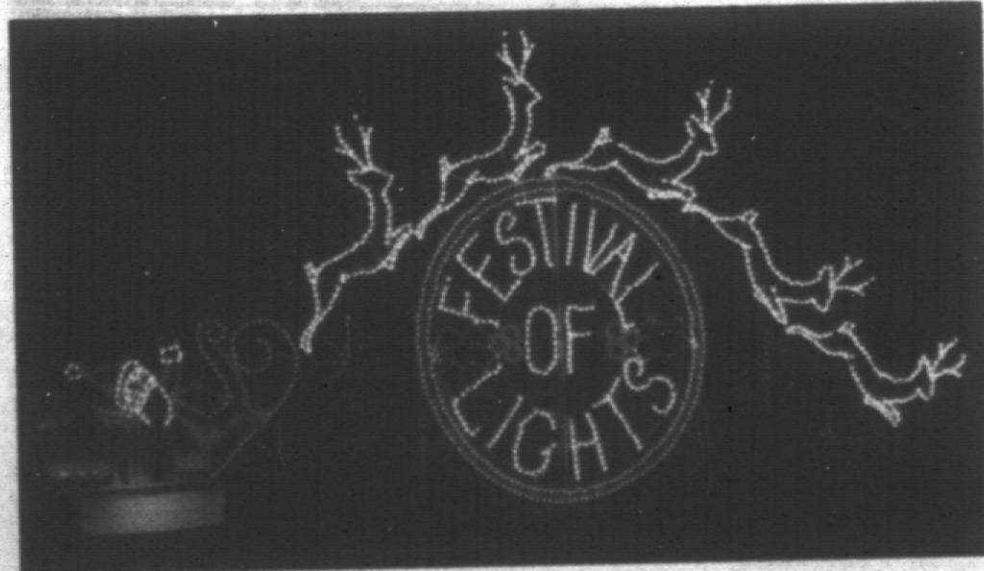
The 1994 Parade Honor Corps will feature students from 86 public and private high schools in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties, including several Detroit high schools.

Area school superintendents were asked to select outstanding students to represent their districts in the parade. Parade Honor Corps students selected met excellent attendance standards, had outstanding academic performance with a grade point average of 3.0 or above, and were involved in extracurricular activities.

Students in this year's "human float," as it has been described, will also carry their school banners and pennants, creating a rainbow of brilliant colors when they march down Woodward Avenue. They will wear blue jackets bearing the

touches the human heart more than the religious figure," said DeLauro at an interview in his Canton studio.

"It was a nice occasion. That always makes an artist happy, to know he's appreciated."

The Rev. Luther Werth, pastor of the 1,500-member congregation, had commissioned the Christ sculpture in May 1992, but problems with the wall's construction delayed installation for a year.

"When we were preparing to build the church the architect, Ron Cieslak of Farmington, said he had this large expanse of wall," Werth said.

"I went to work right away to fill it."

After searching long and hard for a solution, Werth found the answer he was looking for in Matthew 11:28.

"It took off on a Bible passage that has Christ, our savior, with his arms upheld welcoming all. 'Come to me all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest,' the passage reads. That's basically the theme of the statue," Werth said.

"It's art, and it adds a little bit more to the community of Livonia. It's a nice addition out there on Farmington Road. It's our hope that it's a statement of what we believe."

DeLauro, who retired as chairman and founder of the University of Windsor's fine art department in 1983, originally made a 36-inch clay model for the sculpture in his home studio. After being given the go-ahead by Werth for the design, DeLauro went to work sculpting the 12-foot figure in clay onto an armature of wire, wood and plaster of Paris at Metro-Cast Corp. in Westland.

The finished clay model is used in making a mold for casting the final sculpture.

Initially, the 78-year-old sculptor cajoled and manipulated the clay horizontally, but eventually the time came when the figure had to be righted to the position it would appear on the wall.

"Then vertically because your vision of it changes."

Satisfied with the figure, DeLauro then applied a thick layer of plaster over the clay to make a massive mold. Once dried, he chipped away the clay. Finally, the sculpture was ready to be cast

using a material called polycarbonate.

If it had been cast in bronze, the sculpture would have cost five times as much. As it was, DeLauro's commission for the sculpture cost the church \$20,000.

DeLauro would never have released the sculpture to the church for installation two weeks ago if it hadn't met his high standards first.

"It fits right on the exterior of the church. Its scale is right; the terra cotta color was right for the brick surface."

DeLauro, who earned a bachelor of fine arts degree from Yale University and a master of fine art from the University of Iowa, has artwork in private and public collections from Italy to South America, including a five-ton marble sculpture, "The Pieta," in Chicago.

Locally, his work is permanently installed at Madonna University in Livonia, the Detroit Public Library, Fairlane Manor in Dearborn, and churches and seminaries too numerous to mention.

In Windsor, DeLauro's 11-foot bronze work illustrating the Creation story according to the Iroquois and Wyandotte Indians' myth can be seen at the Hiram Walker & Sons distillery. Also, he has a sculpture based on the Holocaust at the Jewish Community Center in Windsor.

In Canton Township, DeLauro's 26-inch bronze, "The Storyteller," greets visitors to the Can-

ton Public Library.

His current commission for the Italian Caboto Club in Windsor is a sculpture of John Cabot (Giovanni Caboto), a European explorer who came to Canada. It will be completed by 1997, just in time to honor Caboto on the 500th anniversary of his arrival.

executive director.

"As far as recruiting businesses, we would like to think we could control something. But it gets beyond our grasp," Adamusik said. "Our goal maybe could be to try to attract larger businesses and have a place for them. We also want our smaller establishments to stay here."

Canton Trustee Bob Shefferly, who served with the task force group which developed retail and office recommendations, said the creation of an economic development office is key to the success of Ford Road.

"In a lot of ways we weren't too realistic (with recommendations). But we weren't supposed to be," Shefferly said.

Yack said that some Ford Road Task Force recommendations, such as reducing larger business signs, may prove to be controversial with the business community. But perhaps a system could be developed where businesses have

a number of years to change their signs to the lower-to-the-ground type, he added.

Canton trustees are expected to formally accept the Ford Road Task Force report in the near future. The recommendations and strategies could be used during township budget preparation as a means of accomplishing the report's goals, Yack said.

Political analyst downplays GOP victories

From what political analyst Bill Ballenger sees, the Democrats didn't fare too badly in the Nov. 8 election.

"I really don't think the Democratic party should feel quite so depressed," said radio commentator Ballenger, publisher of Inside Michigan Politics.

Ballenger told the Canton Economic Club Wednesday that Gov. John Engler's coattails didn't slide all Republicans into office. Engler's re-election helped candidates such as U.S. Senate-elect Spencer Abraham and Secretary of State-elect Candice Miller. But other Democrats were elected and re-elected, such as State Attorney General Frank Kelley.

"They barely squeaked into the majority," Ballenger said, of the Republicans who now have 56 seats - a majority - in the state House.

Anti-incumbent talk also didn't pan out to unseat the experienced - except nationally for the Democrats. "No Republican running for the U.S. House, the U.S. Senate got defeated," said Ballenger, a former state senator and representative. The only Republican incumbent from Michigan who was defeated was Gil DiNello of Macomb County.

Ballenger said he thought the Republicans would do better than they did in races for the state Legislature. He referred to township clerk Loren Bennett's narrow win over Democratic opponent Charles "Trav" Griffin of Westland. "If Loren Bennett had not won, Republicans would have

lost seats in the Legislature."

On another level - university boards of education - Republicans again didn't sweep the winning field. "In fact, two Democrats got elected," Ballenger said.

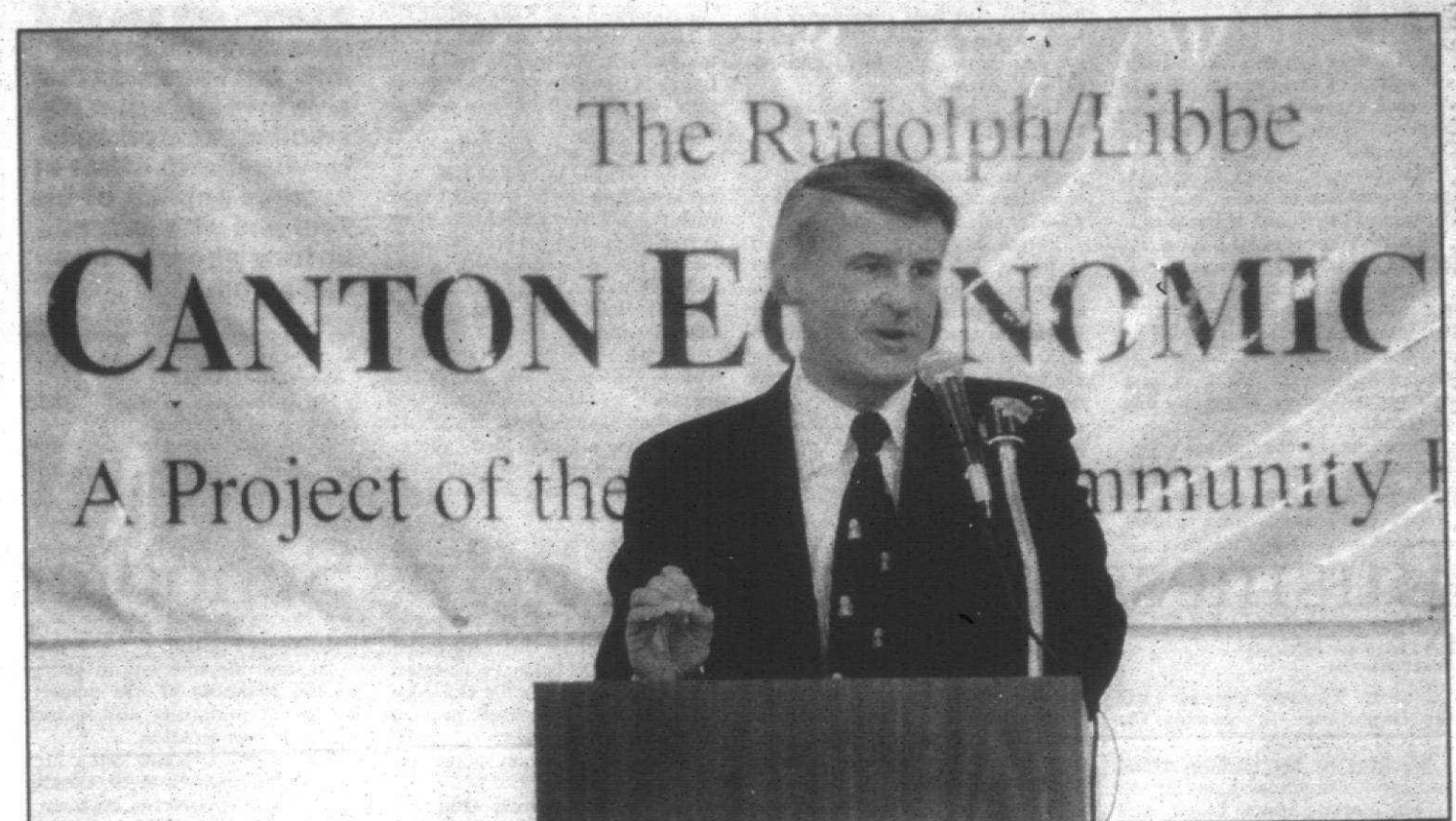
It was also the university boards where women shined the most. "This is the year of the angry, white male," Ballenger said, contrary to 1992 - the year of the woman. Nonetheless women did well, including on the state Supreme Court, which now has three female justices.

In 14 statewide races for courts where 241 judgeships were open, 55 candidates were women and nine of them won. "They continue to do well in judicial races," Ballenger said.

That's not to mention state House races, where 30 women were elected. "This is an all-time record," Ballenger told the audience that there is a farm system - like in baseball - for women. "There is strength there that is growing and growing."

In response to audience questions, Ballenger said he believes the Republicans will be a cohesive group in the state Legislature in Engler's second administration. "They really are a homogenous, monolithic group caucus." Any Republican who could cause trouble for Engler is really to the far right of the governor politically, Ballenger said.

"John Engler is the Republican Party in this state. He controls the Republican Party like no one else has since World War

II," Ballenger said. "He almost functions (more) as party chair than as a governor."

Ballenger also responded to a question about Engler's upcoming agenda. "I'm sure a lot of his

agenda will depend on the economy," he said. "If the economy goes sour, that could change a lot of things."

Engler's agenda could include changing or scrapping the single

business tax, as well as changes in the charter school law and perhaps fine-tuning labor legislation.

While Engler isn't likely to do the Michigan Education Association any favors, Ballenger said he

doubts the governor will try to revive the organization. "Any organization that can run as much money into races has got to be considered a key player in the future."

Downtown Plymouth's storefronts filling up

Empty storefronts in downtown Plymouth aren't remaining empty for long these days.

Plymouth shoppers this Christmas season will notice some new businesses and familiar stores in new locations, as there's been plenty of activity downtown this fall.

■ Wild Wings gallery on Ann Arbor Trail (near Harvey) is moving to the northwest corner of Main Street and Ann Arbor

Street, moved to a bigger building at 895 Wing in September.

The most prominent downtown business change is the upcoming move of Wild Wings to the Main Street space vacated this summer by Aventura. "We want to be in there in early January, before the ice fest," Jabara said.

"We think it's one of the best corners in Plymouth for exposure," he said, adding the line of outdoor art will be expanded to suit the space and a broader line of gift ware will be added.

Jabara, who said the business

will soon mark its 15th anniversary, added, "I'm really looking forward to the move."

Dan Argonis, 27, owner of Venture, said the idea for the outdoor wear store came to him in college. After working a time in similar stores in Arizona, he decided to open a store here. "I like the idea of being back where I started," he said. Argonis is a 1984 Plymouth Salem High graduate.

He describes the store as a specialty outdoor retailer "in the mid-to-high end," offering camping and hiking gear and clothing.

To test a variety of hiking outdoor boots he offers, there is a rock incline customers can use.

He plans to have a pond in the store, which customers can use to test water purifiers he sells.

"It's a fun store," Argonis said. He also has small meeting rooms in the rear of the store, for product demonstrations or talks with customers headed by outdoor products sales representatives.

John Kwieciec's sports collectibles store, Trader Jack's, features rows and rows of sports cards, autographed cards and

pucks, sports clothing and more.

Detroit Red Wings forward Shawn Burr was in the store Nov. 13 to sign autographs, and other local sports stars have been in. Hockey cards are especially popular, matching the popularity of the Red Wings in recent years, Kwieciec said.

Autographed items include a Barry Sanders helmet for \$300 and a baseball signed by the Tigers' Cecil Fielder for \$35.

"Some autographed memorabilia is perfect for the guy that has everything," Kwieciec said.

No contract Teachers, schools in mediation

Seven hours of mediation Thursday night failed to bring the Plymouth-Canton school board and the local teachers' union closer to a settlement on open contract issues.

"Nothing crucial occurred," said Chuck Portelli, president of the teachers' union. "Except the board met with the mediator. That's a first for Plymouth-Canton."

Still under dispute are teacher salaries for this year and next, and the calendar for the 1995-96 school year. Also unresolved is contract language regarding school improvement, decentralized administrative

procedures that allow individual schools in the district to make more of their own decisions.

Bargaining between the district and teachers, cafeteria workers, custodians and para-professionals has been stalled for some time. All four employee associations have turned to mediation.

Thursday, representatives of the district and the union waited in separate conference rooms in the school's administration building. A state mediator shuttled between them, relaying proposed terms, but by 10:30 p.m. no new agreement had been reached.

A second meeting has been scheduled for 6 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 22. In the meantime, representatives for both the union and the district declined to comment on the possibility of a walkout.

"I want to give the process a chance to work," said Tom Cotner, a Plymouth Salem instructor who sits on the teachers' bargaining team.

Under a bill recently passed by state lawmakers, teacher strikes after the end of the current school year will evoke harsher penalties for both teachers and school districts.

Plymouth attorney a fellow of trial lawyers group

J. Thomas Lenga of Plymouth, a member of the Detroit office of Dykema Gossett PLLC, has become a fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers.

Membership, which is considered a position of honor, is by invitation of the Board of Regents. "I didn't know until I got a letter that I qualified," Lenga said.

Lenga still has no idea who nominated him, but knows extensive investigation was involved as well as interviews with other attorneys outside of his firm and with judges before whom he has appeared.

According to the college's by-laws, members must be actively engaged in trial work and must be

the American Bar Association."

Lenga becomes the 30th Dykema Gossett attorney to be listed. Lenga is listed in the 1995-96 edition of "The Best Lawyers in America."

With 240 attorneys, Dykema Gossett PLLC is one of the largest law firms in the United States with five offices in Michigan (Ann Arbor, Bloomfield Hills, Detroit, Grand Rapids and Lansing), and in Washington, D.C. and Chicago.

Business background helps Schoolcraft administrator

Noreen Thomas learned early the importance of meeting the needs of customers.

Working in her parents' retail and service businesses as early as 11, she learned how to handle and relate to customers.

Some 33 years later, she is doing the same thing in her new position as dean of college centers for Schoolcraft College.

Specifically, she will direct the Radcliff Center, on the Garden City/Westland boundary, for the 10,000-plus students who use the building seven days a week for

various educational purposes.

Thomas, a Farmington Hills resident whose promotion was announced by the college's administration Wednesday night, succeeds Edwynna Dansby, who headed the center for several years before passing away six weeks ago.

Thomas, promoted from Schoolcraft's associate dean for educational services, talked about Radcliff and its future during an interview in her office Thursday morning.

No changes are planned for the center since she and Dansby were "in tune with each other" philo-

sophically and in their approach of meeting the college's mission statement and goals for the center, on Radcliff, just south of Ford and east of Wildwood.

"We will build on what we started," she said.

If she does anything different, it will be more activities in "community outreach and getting closer to the programs, making sure we're delivering the quality that we strive to achieve," she said.

Her management style would be to "generate enthusiasm among the staff and the community," Thomas said. Hopefully, the enthusiasm "will be contagious and snowball."

Thomas is no stranger to Radcliff.

As Schoolcraft's purchasing director about 10 years ago, she was project manager for the move from a smaller satellite center in Gar-

den City to Radcliff.

In that role, she was in charge of the planning of the massive moving of equipment and materials to the new location.

The center, a former junior high school, has more than 10,000 students in its classrooms between 8 a.m. to 10 p.m. weekdays as well as parts of Saturday and Sunday, part of the "weekend college" initiated two years ago.

With her background in her parents' business in Buffalo, N.Y., and later in education, Thomas learned the relationship of business and education.

"My dad taught me the intuitive parts (of the business) — meeting customers' needs. That's what we have been here at Schoolcraft," Thomas said.

In various positions since joining the college staff as a business department cashier in 1978,

In the latter post, Thomas' efforts led to a 75 percent increase in enrollment and initiated several professional certification programs in continuing education.

Under her direction, the department administered 1,000 courses serving 14,000 pupils a year.

She also handled financial operations, enrollment objectives and developed and implemented programming, including a needs assessment, marketing and delivering of educational services.

Outside of her Schoolcraft responsibilities, Thomas has been a leader in various areas, including winner of national awards and president of the Michigan Community Colleges Community Services Association in 1991.

The Livonia fire department honored her for her work in fire education programs that it named her an honorary fire chief last year.

Thomas received her bachelor's degree in management from Daemen College, in Amherst, N.Y., and her master's degree in educational leadership from Eastern Michigan University. She is married and the mother of two sons.

Law will legalize home music teaching

Legislation that would allow music instructors to teach scales, sonatas and solos in their homes without worry is poised for passage in the state Legislature.

The question is whether a lame-duck House of Representatives will consider the bills before the legislative session ends, said Sen. David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, a sponsor, who expects approval of the three-bill package that permits academic tutoring at home.

"If they meet at all, it's going to pass, and I expect they're going to meet again," said Honigman. The state Senate overwhelmingly approved the bills, which Honigman said have bi-partisan support. But one House aide familiar with the legislation said the chamber was unlikely to take up the

measures this year.

Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, predicted the package would be passed this year. Faxon has long been a patron of the arts.

"I don't see where there should be any problem with them," Faxon said.

The bills would establish a state law allowing art and music teachers to practice their profession without running afoul of municipal ordinances that regulate home businesses.

The bills were introduced twice before but failed to reach the floors of both houses for votes.

"This is the farthest we've ever gotten," the senator said.

He first introduced the legislation in 1987 after a West Bloomfield Township couple was cited for teaching music in their home.

"We've gotten so many professional musicians out of our

studio, but one of our neighbors decided he wanted to try to stop us," said Betty Kowalsky Stassen, a piano teacher who pushed for state legislation to solve the problem after getting a ticket.

West Bloomfield eventually passed an ordinance that allows home-based music teachers, but some other municipalities haven't, Stassen said. Music teachers still get ticketed.

Stassen, whose home contains two Steinway grand pianos, said she and her husband, Gerald, a violin and strings instructor, now teach about three days a week.

"It's not business, it's education," Stassen said. She argues that music teachers provide a vital service in encouraging and developing talent and a love of the arts.

Passage of the legislation, which the Senate approved in near-unanimous votes last May,

"will make us feel like we're not criminals," said Arvi Sinka, a piano teacher.

"At this moment, in nearly every municipality in the state, teaching music in the home is in a pianist with the Birmingham-Bloomfield Symphony Orchestra.

Honigman said the legislation had received some opposition from municipal associations but that he believed their concerns had been resolved.

If the bills are not passed by the end of December, they would have to be introduced a fourth time, Honigman said.

"As of now, I know of no organized opposition," he said.

He said Republicans, who currently share control of the House with Democrats, may hold off voting on some legislation this year because Republicans will hold a clear majority in the House next year.

Deck the halls with safety and caution

Detroit Edison is cautioning homeowners to be careful this holiday season when they put up electric decorations.

The most important thing to check before stringing lights and setting up other trimmings is to make sure they contain a label from Underwriters Laboratories, Edison said in a press release.

The second-most important consideration is to use lighting as it is intended by the manufacturer — either outdoor or indoor. Also, inspect Christmas lights for frayed wires, damaged sockets and cracked or missing insulation.

Most lights cost 1-7.5 cents per string to operate for six hours, depending on wattage, Edison said. For strands of lights that blink off and on, the cost is halved. Edison offered the following suggestions for a safer holiday season:

Indoor lighting
■ Do not overload electrical circuits. Older home circuits usually cannot safely carry more than 15 amps, or 1,800 watts. Newer homes are able to carry as much as 20 amps or 2,400 watts. For the best results, load to only 80 percent of your home's maximum capacity.

■ Do not insert new bulbs or change fuses when light sets are plugged in.

ORDINANCE NO. C-94-12

MULTI-CHANNEL SERVICE PROVIDER
REGULATORY ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MULTI-CHANNEL SERVICE PROVIDER REGULATORY ORDINANCE WHICH DESCRIBES REGULATORY PRACTICES FOR MULTI-CHANNEL SERVICE PROVIDERS, INCLUDING PROVISIONS FOR INSURANCE, REPORTS AND RECORDS, CONSUMER PRACTICES, CONSUMER PROTECTION MEASURES, CONSTRUCTION AND CONSTRUCTION RELATED PRACTICES, FRANCHISE FEES AND ALTERNATE USER CHARGES, OPERATION PROCEDURES, AND HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE MEASURES, AND AMENDMENT TO THE CONTINUITY OF SERVICE PROVISION, PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES ONLY TO THE EXTENT OF THEIR INCONSISTENCY, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE, PROVIDING FOR PENALTY FOR VIOLATION, PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

SECTION 1.

Section 74.265 of Chapter 74 of the Code of Ordinances of the Charter Township of Plymouth is amended by adding Subsection (G) to read as follows:

Section 74.265. Policy with Respect to Continuity of Multi-Channel Provisions.

A) The Board, franchising authority declares that as part of its right to establish multi-channel customer service guidelines, it has the duty to ensure continuity of multi-channel service for all subscribers. In that light, the Board/franchising authority also determines that it may take appropriate measures in order to ensure that no portion of the Township is threatened or faced with a disruption, interruption or discontinuance of multi-channel service due to the actions of any MCS provider.

B) In addition to the principles and ideals enumerated in subsection (A), the Board/franchising authority also expresses that its policy covers the following:

- 1) providing for continuity of multi-channel service in the event of acquisition by the Township;
- 2) providing for continuity of service in the event of a proposed abandonment, withdrawal, or cessation of multi-channel service by an MCS provider;
- 3) providing for continuity of service in the event of reversion, termination, or non-renewal of a franchised MCS provider's franchise;
- 4) providing for continuity of service in the event that a transaction occurs that affects the ownership or control of the MCS provider, such as an assignment, sale, transfer, or merger;
- 5) providing for continuity of service in the event of an expiration of a franchise;
- 6) preventing disruption of multi-channel service which would provide a hardship on those subscribers who rely on a multi-channel system as their primary or secondary source for information; and
- 7) preventing the interruption or cessation of multi-channel service which would disrupt or eliminate the diversity of programming choices enjoyed by subscribers of a multi-channel system, and thereby restricting their ability to receive information.

C) Whenever any situation occurs (including those mentioned above) which threatens the Township and subscribers with the loss or interruption in the continuity of multi-channel service, then the Board/franchising authority may direct the MCS provider for a period of up to twenty-four (24) months to do everything in its power to ensure that all subscribers receive continuous, uninterrupted multi-channel service of the same quality, mix, and level(s) regardless of the circumstances.

D) During the interim period, the Board/franchising authority shall work with the MCS provider in order to secure a new multi-channel system owner, or rectify the problem, so that the threat of loss of continuity is removed at the earliest possible instance.

E) During any interim period in which the MCS provider continues to provide multi-channel service to subscribers, the MCS provider is entitled to all revenues collected, except any sums owed (including franchise fees, alternative user charges, and taxes) to the Township or to other persons.

F) In the event that the threat of loss of continuity is not resolved within twenty-four (24) months, then the Board/franchising authority may extend the interim period of a month-to-month basis until the situation is satisfactorily resolved. Also, in such a circumstance, the Board/franchising authority may adopt any emergency rules or procedures which will ensure that the subscribers will receive continuous, uninterrupted multi-channel service of the same quality, mix, and level(s).

G) This section 74.265 shall take immediate effect upon publication notwithstanding any other provision of this Multi-Channel Service Provider Regulatory Ordinance and shall be applicable to all cable operators, cable services, cable systems or multi-channel service providers operating in the Township without exemption or relief and is particularly applicable to existing franchisees.

SECTION 2: SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion hereof.

SECTION 3: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 4: SAVINGS CLAUSE.

The rights and duties which have matured, penalties which have been incurred, proceedings which have begun and prosecution for violations of law occurring before the effective date of this Ordinance are not affected or abated by this ordinance. With the exception of section 74.265 amended herein, the remainder of Chapter 74 is unaffected and hereby saved intact.

SECTION 5: VIOLATION AND PENALTY.

Any person, corporation, partnership or other legal entity who violates the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined not more than sixty (60) days, or both, at the discretion of the Court. Each day that the violation continues after due notice has been served in accordance with the terms and provisions hereof shall be deemed a separate offense.

SECTION 6: PUBLICATION.

The Clerk for the Charter Township of Plymouth shall cause this Ordinance to be published in the manner required by law.

SECTION 7: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take full force and effect upon publication thereof.

EMERGENCY WATER USE REDUCTION ORDINANCE

THIS ORDINANCE AMENDS CHAPTER 73, WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH, BY ADDING SECTION 73.240 ET SEQ WHICH SHALL BE KNOWN AS THE EMERGENCY WATER USE REDUCTION ORDINANCE, AN ORDINANCE TO DECLARE A WATER USE REDUCTION EMERGENCY; PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF METERS TO MONITOR WATER FLOW AND WATER REDUCTION; PROVIDING THAT POLICE OFFICERS AND CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ARE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE ORDINANCE VIOLATION NOTICES AND CITATIONS UNDER THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR CONDITIONS WARRANTING INITIATION OF WATER USE REDUCTION; PROVIDING FOR A DECLARATION OF A WATER USE REDUCTION EMERGENCY; PROVIDING FOR A PROHIBITION OF WATER USE DURING A WATER USE REDUCTION EMERGENCY; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

SECTION 1.

Section 73.240.

This Ordinance shall be known as the Emergency Water Use Reduction Ordinance and shall read as follows:

A. Every person, firm, or corporation whose premises are supplied by water by the Charter Township of Plymouth shall be subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, and to all rules and regulations of the Public Works Manager pertaining to use of Township water.

B. It shall be lawful for the Public Works Manager, or his designee, to enter upon the premises of any person using Township water to install meters for measuring water used and to inspect the meters and other fixtures and appliances pertaining to the Water Works System.

C. Code Enforcement Officers of the Charter Township of Plymouth and Police Officers of the Charter Township of Plymouth are hereby authorized to issue Ordinance Violation Notices and/or Ordinance Violation Citations to any person or persons, firm or corporation violating any provision of this Ordinance or any rule or regulation duly adopted in pursuance of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2.

Section 73.250.

The following are conditions warranting declaration of a Water Use Reduction Emergency:

A. A prolonged drought or other system-wide heavy demand period that results in supply facilities, including system pump stations and reservoirs, being operated at their optimum capacity with no apparent means immediately available to adequately maintain flows and residual pressures throughout the system.

B. Any emergency condition that may arise which will negatively affect operating flows and residual pressures in any substantial portion of the Township water system for any appreciable length of time.

SECTION 3.

Section 73.260.

Upon declaration of a water use reduction emergency by the City of Detroit Water and Sewer Department, the Michigan Department of Public Health, the Charter Township of Plymouth, the Charter Township of Plymouth shall announce such declaration by use of public radio or television and newspapers with normal operating range covering the community. The Public Works Manager or his designee shall implement whatever reductions are necessary to meet the water reduction requirements.

SECTION 4.

Section 73.270. Prohibition of Water Use During Water Use Reduction Emergency.

A. Upon the declaration of a water use reduction emergency as outlined in Sections 73.250 and 73.260 above, every person, firm, or corporation whose premises are supplied with water by the Charter Township of Plymouth shall refrain from watering or using water provided by the Charter Township of Plymouth in any way prohibited by the Water Use Reduction Emergency declaration. The prohibition shall remain in effect twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week until the Township has declared an end to the water use reduction emergency or the Township determines that a limited prohibition will be sufficient to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of the community.

B. The Public Works Manager or his designee may provide exception to Section 73.270, (paragraph A) where necessary to prevent imminent financial loss to a water user.

SECTION 5.

Section 73.280. Penalty.

Any person who shall willfully violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine or not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars and the costs of prosecution or by imprisonment for not more than sixty (60) days or engagement in community service, or any combination of such fine, imprisonment or community service, plus any costs involved in shutting off the water.

SECTION 6. Severability.

Each day that the violation continues after due notice has been served in accordance with the terms and provisions hereof shall be deemed a separate offense.

SECTION 7. Savings Clause.

The rights and duties which have matured, penalties which have been incurred, proceedings which have begun and prosecution for violations of law occurring before the effective date of this Ordinance are not affected or abated by this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. Effectiveness.

This ordinance shall take full force and effect upon publication thereof.

CERTIFICATION

Crash simulator added at local firm

Car seat maker Johnson Controls has added a \$2.8 million vehicle crash simulator to its Plymouth Township facility — making it the first independent car seat supplier in North America to have in-house crash testing.

"Our new testing system is an asset to our company and to our customers," said Jerry Zimmerman, Johnson Controls chief engineer for technical services.

The sled can simulate a crash up to 35 miles per hour. The crash test dummies are supplied by another Plymouth Township firm — First Technology Systems Inc.

"All along we've had to do sled testing off site. A lot of times, booking the tests is tough," said

Jeff Steiner, company spokesman. "Having a sled on site allows us to evaluate designs faster and shrink design time down," Steiner said.

The crash simulator is supplied by CVC Products of Syracuse, N.Y. It is one of 30 such systems in use by major automotive companies.

It simulates crash conditions to allow Johnson Controls to produce car seats that meet dynamic impact requirements that comply with federal standards.

The system includes an 80-foot track, an accelerating test sled, computer-controlled activating devices and sensors, high-speed cameras and a high-speed video

OMNIBUS CABLE TELEVISION

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 71.046 OF CHAPTER 71 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH, EXTENDING THE FRANCHISE EXPIRATION DATE TO FEBRUARY 4, 1995, PROVIDING FOR SAVINGS OF THE REMAINDER OF CHAPTER 71; PROVIDING REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT PROVISIONS THEREIN; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

SECTION 1.

Section 71.046, Term, is amended to read as follows: 71.046. Term. Subject to the provisions herein, the rights and privileges of the grantee shall continue for a period of fifteen (15) years from February 4, 1994, which shall be deemed to constitute a contract between the Township and said grantee. Further, said grantee shall have the right of first refusal in renegotiation.

SECTION 2: SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion hereof.

SECTION 3: REPEAL OF INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION 4: SAVINGS CLAUSE. The rights and duties which have matured, penalties which have been incurred, proceedings which have begun and prosecution for violations of law occurring before the effective date of this Ordinance are not affected or abated by this ordinance.

SECTION 5: VIOLATION AND PENALTY. Any person, corporation, partnership or other legal entity who violates the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or imprisoned not more than sixty (60) days, or both, at the discretion of the Court. Each day that the violation continues after due notice has been served in accordance with the terms and provisions hereof shall be deemed a separate offense.

SECTION 6: PUBLICATION. The Clerk for the Charter Township of Plymouth shall cause this Ordinance to be published in the manner required by law.

SECTION 7: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take full force and effect upon publication thereof. Objections to the release of funds on the basis other than those stated above will not be considered by HUD. No objection received after December 23, 1994 will be considered by HUD.

State road crews bracing for winter weather

State and county highway maintenance crews are preparing for snow, sleet and freezing rain.

"Keeping our state's 9,550-mile highway system clear of ice and snow is our top priority during the winter," said Michigan Department of Transportation spokesman Paul Nowak.

The state government says it will spend nearly \$40 million for snow and other winter maintenance this year, about a third of its annual highway maintenance budget.

M-DOT says it will give the highest priority to plowing heavily traveled highways that average at least 5,000 vehicles a day in volume.

They will be plowed as soon as possible until the pavement is

generally bare of ice and snow. Lesser traveled highways will be plowed until the center portion of the road is clear or until the pavement is passable.

They will be fully cleared later during normal work hours.

The department maintains state highways in 21 counties and partners with road commissions and public works departments in

the remaining 62 counties and 154 cities.

M-DOT maintenance improvements in the state include increasing the use of permanent raised pavement markers to better delineate lanes for nighttime guidance.

The reflectorized markings, which are on about 75 percent of non-lighted freeways in the state,

show up better than painted lines during wet conditions.

The department also is installing flexible reflector posts in high impact areas, such as freeway ramps.

The posts are constructed of a flexible plastic that bends and rebounds on impact.

Besides improved safety to motorists and less vehicle damage,

they are more cost effective and require little to no maintenance once installed, M-DOT officials say.

Motorists are warned to watch out for ice on bridges.

Cold air passing under the bridge causes the temperature of the bridge deck to drop.

While the adjoining pavement may be dry, condensation forms

on the bridge deck and freezes, making driving treacherous.

Motorists are also cautioned not to follow snow plows closely.

The blizzard-like conditions that typically surround a snow make it difficult to follow closely or pass.

And there's a risk of being hit by rocks, chunks of ice or salt thrown from the plow.

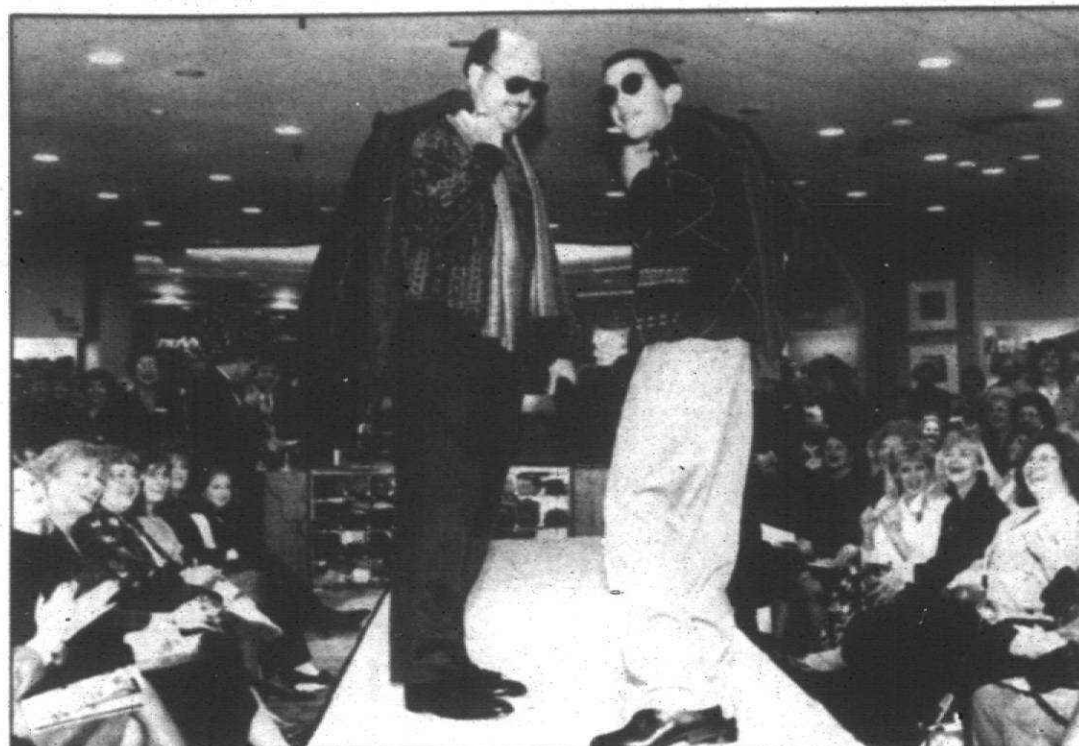

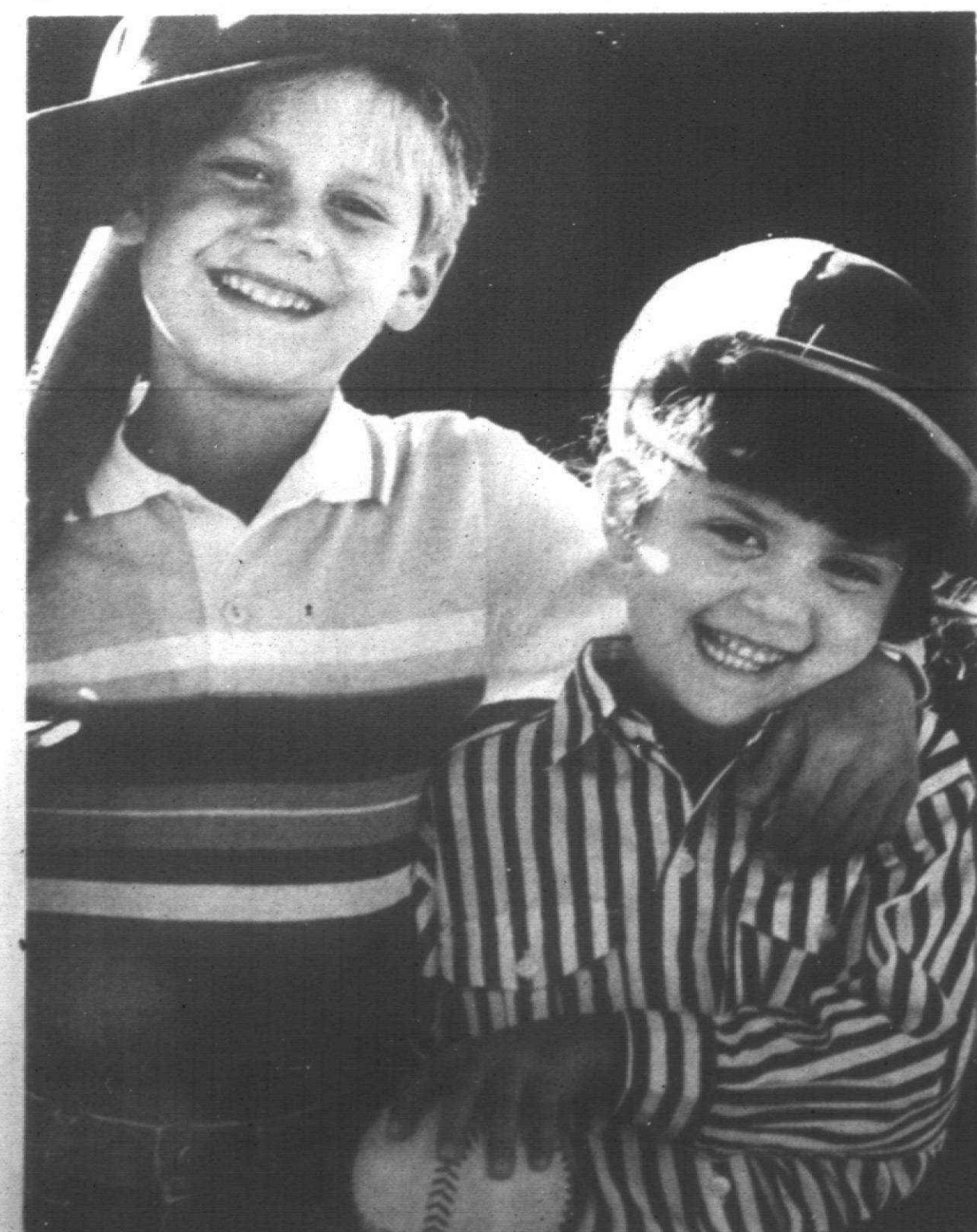

State balks at long sentences for repeat offenders

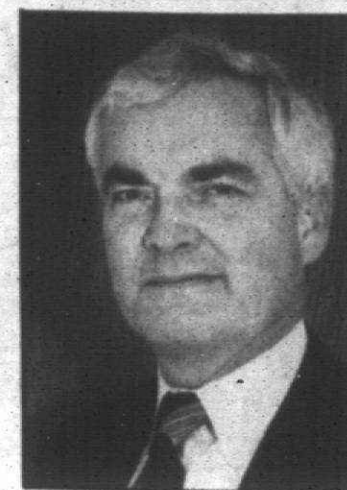
The Department of Corrections is asking the state Supreme Court to overturn a decision by the Court of Appeals that has resulted in much longer prison sentences for parolees who commit new crimes.

The July 5 Court of Appeals decision said that parolees convicted of new felony crimes must serve the remaining portion of their maximum sentence for the first crime before beginning any part of the sentence for the second crime.

Since January 1993, when this interpretation of the law began to be enforced by the Department of Corrections, more than 700 re-offending parolees have been returned to prison to finish their maximum sentences. None of those people will be eligible for parole for a long time.

The Department of Corrections thinks that prison overcrowding and financial problems will result if the Court of Appeals ruling stands.

"This new form of consecutive sentence will require the Department of Corrections to expend a considerable amount of funds over the coming years to house

The document concludes by asking the Supreme Court to rule that parolees who commit new crimes should serve only the minimum sentence for the new crime before being eligible for parole again.

"We just want to have some real clarity as to what the statute calls for," said Warren Williams, a spokesman for the Department of Corrections.

The court was interpreting a law passed by the Legislature and

Sen. George Hart

signed by then-Gov. James Blanchard in 1988.

The Supreme Court has not yet decided whether to accept the case.

The law was never widely enforced until Wayne County chief assistant prosecutor George Ward pursued the case of Gregory Lee Young, who has 15 felony convictions to his credit.

Young committed a breaking and entering offense in September

1991 while on parole for armed robbery.

Ward argued his case in front of Recorder's Court Judge Lawrence Silverman, who ruled that Young must finish the remaining nine years of his armed robbery sentence before beginning the three-year minimum sentence for breaking and entering.

The Department of Corrections balked at Silverman's ruling, and a declaratory judgment by Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Su-

san Bieks-Neelson was requested. Bieks-Neelson backed Ward, a resident of Plymouth Township, and the case went to the state Court of Appeals.

"I don't think of myself as a bloodthirsty prosecutor," Ward said. "But why do we prosecute the same guy 15 times? I am trying to point the way out of the woods."

State Sens. George Hart, D-Dearborn, and William Van Regenmorter, R-Jenison, chair of the Senate Judiciary Committee, are on Ward's side.

"I think the (Circuit Court) ruling is correct," Van Regenmorter said. "I recognize in some cases it will mean an exceptionally long sentence, but it's dealing with repeat offenders."

Hart's objection was more partisan. "The governor likes to brag that he and his administration are tough on crime, but the Corrections Department's decision to appeal this case to the Supreme Court certainly contradicts that claim," he said. "It is disappointing that the administration does not want to stop the revolving door of the criminal justice system."

Relax and plan your great turkey dinner

I'll never forget the first time I cooked Thanksgiving dinner. I didn't have 27 years of cooking experience under my belt, and felt totally overwhelmed.

My heart went out to Sandy from Southfield who nervously approached me one afternoon at a Kitchen Glamor store.

This is going to be Sandy's first year preparing Thanksgiving dinner for her in-laws, who are coming from upstate New York. Sandy said she knows nothing about cooking a turkey, let alone making an entire dinner.

This column's for you

If you've never attempted to prepare a full turkey dinner, then this is the column for you. Mothers, clip this out and send it to your kids, or file it until they're old enough to invite you over. You won't be disappointed.

First off Sandy, the best thing you can do is plan ahead. Work out the menu and choose some recipes. Then write your shopping list.

Experience has taught me to write down what needs to be done at what time. If appetizers and desserts can be made a day or two ahead, why not take advantage?

When it comes to buying a turkey, fresh birds are best. Allow one pound of uncooked bird per person, more if you want leftovers. Order your bird today.

Check your spice rack to make sure you have what you need. Ditto for serving pieces, cookware, utensils and cutlery.

Look for Yukon Golds

Plan on eight ounces (½ pound) of potatoes and vegetables per person. When it comes to potatoes, look for Yukon Golds, they make great mashed, roasted or baked potatoes, and are easy to find at grocery stores.

For convenience, turn fresh or frozen vegetables into casseroles. Definitely do this the day before.

People love stuffing, and it can be as easy or as complicated as you choose to make it. Plan on two cups of stuffing per person and, whatever you do, don't stuff the turkey! Cooking the stuffing separate in a covered casserole shortens the cooking time of the turkey. Homemade breads and rolls are nice, but check out the selections from specialty bakeries in your area. Buy breads and rolls ahead of time, wrap and freeze. Pop them in the oven for 10 minutes while the food is being placed on the table Thanksgiving Day.

Remove the turkey from the refrigerator one hour before roasting begins. As a rule, unstuffed birds require 16 minutes per pound while stuffed birds require 20.

Make sure it's done

When it comes to cooking the turkey, the most difficult task is deciding when it's cooked. Invest in a good thermometer and cook the bird until the temperature in the thickest part of its thigh, without touching the bone, reaches 165 degrees.

But before you cook the bird, remember to wash the inside and remove the bag containing the giblets, neck, gizzard, etc. Rinse the bird inside and out with cold water. Pat dry with paper towels. Lightly season the turkey inside and out with salt and fresh ground pepper.

You can make a stock with the neck and giblets by placing them in a small saucepan and covering with two cups of water. Bring to a boil, reduce the heat and simmer for 1 hour. If you desire, insert a cut up onion and any fresh herbs like parsley, celery leaves or fresh sage in the cavity and truss, if you know how. If you don't, forget it.

Now it's time to begin cooking. Preheat the oven to 425 degrees. Place the turkey, breast side up, on a greased rack in a shallow roasting pan just large enough to hold the bird. Melt a stick of butter and cut a 14 by 24-inch piece of cheesecloth. Soak the cheesecloth in the melted butter until all butter has been absorbed. Double the cheesecloth and drape it over the turkey breast (this ensures a moist, not overcooked breast).

Place the turkey in the oven and immediately reduce the heat to 325 degrees. Using a large bulb baster, baste the turkey through the cheesecloth with the pan drippings every 30 minutes. About 45 minutes before the turkey is finished, remove the cheesecloth. Continue roasting and baste every 10 minutes. Check the temperature at this time. When the bird reaches 165 degrees, transfer the turkey to a carving board and cover loosely with foil and allow to rest for 20-25 minutes.

The bird's internal temperature will rise about 10 degrees, and the bird will retain more juices. Make the gravy and mash potatoes.

Preparing for Hanukkah is 'men's work'

Most people think of candles, not food, when it comes to Hanukkah. But for some families, food is an important part of this "Festival of the Lights," which is observed over eight nights beginning at sundown, Nov. 27.

According to Danny Katzenstein of Beverly Hills, preparing food for the celebration commemorating the Maccabees' rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem in 165 BC, has become a male tradition in his family.

"My father, father-in-law and I make the potato latkes for our family celebration," Katzenstein said. "This year we're going to introduce my eight-year-old son, Joshua, to this custom."

Grandfather Sonny Schwartz of Farmington Hills said that while Josh is going to be taught "the skill of making not only good, but great, latkes, one tradition - that of cooking with a glass of vodka in one hand - will have to be postponed for a number of years."

Josh's other grandfather, William Katzenstein of Birmingham, said

that the vodka is needed to inspire the chefs.

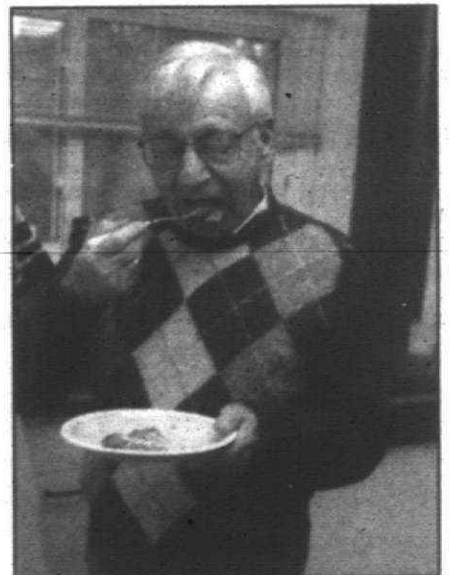
"It also makes it much easier to handle the less-than-pleasant task of peeling lots and lots of potatoes."

Danny Katzenstein said potato latkes, also known as potato pancakes, are a traditional Hanukkah food because they are cooked in oil.

"Oil is a significant ingredient to Hanukkah. After the Maccabees threw out the Greeks and their idols, they lit a lamp to help them clean up the Temple. There was only enough oil in the lamp to last one night, but a miracle happened. The oil lasted for eight days," he said.

"Cooking food in oil is one way of marking this occasion. Another is lighting the menorah (a candelabrum that holds nine candles). One candle is lit the first night, two the second and one on each of the remaining nights of Hanukkah."

William Katzenstein said that while latkes are the tradition of Jews in this country, deep-fried pastries similar to jelly-filled donuts are the

tradition in Israel.

According to the three chefs, some American Jewish families also make "heizenblozen" for their celebration.

"This is cookie dough that is deep fried in oil. While being fried, the dough expands. The result are odd-shaped puffs that are sweetened with powdered sugar and cinnamon," said Danny Katzenstein.

Sweet treats are not the main concern of Sonny Schwartz. He said his

It's in the cards at Penn & Paige

Sure, you could stop at the drugstore or the neighborhood Hallmark for a generic holiday sentiment, but **Darin Asselin** of **Penn & Paige, Ltd.**, 331 Main St. in downtown Rochester, shops London's prestigious international stationery show for the most original and captivating greeting cards to purvey in his shop.

All of his cards are works of art, and many are blank inside, awaiting your own thoughtful message. Some, like those designed by photographer Gretchen L. vanHousier, combine an artwork with a line of poetry. **Zed Publishing's** "love cards" began as a thesis project for two Harvard students until they were "discovered" and financed by Merv Griffin.

Past glories

The most expensive card in the shop is a three-dimensional montage of handmade and imported papers by **Two Women** (\$11). Their holiday line, called **Vintage Postage**, features authentic Christmas stamps and postcards from decades past, allowing you the opportunity to share someone else's long ago Christmas greeting. This same collection offers cards that appear as mini-sheet music printed with Christmas carols (\$7.49).

For pure charm, select a card by **Hannah's College Fund** (Hannah is now three, and her mom is thinking ahead). The **Hannah** cards feature hand-drawn and stitched bits of crocheted, burlap, dried flowers and potpourri bundles. The **Prima Collection** showcases simple, yet intricate watercolors and pen and ink drawings, and the cards of **Graphique de France** depict reproduction black and white photos from Paris.

Cards for a cause

Roger LaBorde is a British artist whose drawings reflect his "different angle on life," according to Darin. The representations on his holiday cards and gift wrap portray **Regency** (\$7.50), **Darin's** "Card of the Year" is a LaBorde design that pictures two pairs of hands giving and receiving a gift. The back of the card reveals that the hands are reaching from a Romeo-figure to a Juliet-figure on a balcony (\$2.25). A percentage of sales benefits worldwide organizations that help the homeless.

Cards from **Great Arrow Graphics** feature elegant hand silk-screened designs that resemble 19th century wallpaper patterns in holiday greens and reds. Traditional losses by **Regency** (\$7.50), **Darin's** and **William Arthur** (\$15.49) are hardly ordinary. Look for hand-lined envelopes and engraved messages. Ethereal and cherubic describe **Cape Wrath Design Co.** cards (\$10.99), and the ultimate in interactive holiday wishes is the compact disc card of carols by the **Westminster Cathedral Choir** (\$10.99).

One of my favorite offerings at Penn & Paige is a Mosaic angel card from London. Entitled "Sweet Dreams," the mini-cards are photos of actual children with angel wings. The sepia-tone coloring and angelic expressions are enchanting (75 cents).

Darin's sense of humor is reflected in his selection of **Murray's Law Christmas Greetings**. Bright colors, fun graphics and witty lines prevail, including the card with three tipsy elves who sing "Bingle Jells," and the one that shows a flustered Santa chastising his lead reindeer after the sleigh overturns in the snow: "Now what, Mr. Nose-oh-bright?"

Murray's cards also come boxed (\$11). Finally, the **Museum of Modern Art** offers boxed cards designed by contemporary artists (\$12.99-\$14.99). Included are a three-dimensional fireplace with garland and flames, "Warmest Wishes," and a Christmas mobile complete with Santa and a tree.

Though most of the cards at Penn & Paige could be framed as art, you'll find one appropriate for every occasion. And if you're stuck, just ask Darin for assistance. He knows every card on the shelf — after all, he hand-picked each one.

Holiday shopping can really put a dent in your budget if you're not careful. For many people, feverish holiday spending completely wrecks any budget and requires months of penny-pinching afterward to recover.

The last thing you want to do is pay for gifts that were charged during the holiday season several months into the new year. The following steps will help you not over-

spend, and start the new year off in the right financial direction — debt free!

Step 1: Prepare a written personal balance sheet. List all current debts so you can see them in black and white.

Step 2: Make a detailed gift list. List names of everyone you will be buying for and how much you can afford, or are willing to spend, per person.

Step 3: Know which stores have the lowest prices for the specified gifts on your list. Keep an eye open for special sale prices.

Step 4: For some people on your list, a gift that requires your time might be more appreciated than an expensive store bought gift.

Step 5: Consider buying one gift for a family instead of separate items for each family member. Example, purchasing a gift certificate to the Detroit Zoo or Greenfield Village.

back to the town recently and afterward she stopped into Minerva's Dunning's department store to visit her old friend.

Maier and Minerva reminisced about times past in the aisles of ladies sportswear and then said good-bye after telling one another how good it was to see each other.

"That's just the way it is these days," Minerva said, waving. "My customers come in to see me. They bring pictures of their grown children and their grandkids. It's wonderful. I remember them all."

Minerva Chaiken won't reveal her age, but she's been selling clothing to women and children for the past 43 years in downtown Plymouth. In 1951, she and husband, Herbert, now deceased, opened Minerva's on Penniman Avenue. The store did well selling women's and children's wear until one very cold night in January, 1968 when a sizeable fire destroyed the shop along with a Western Union branch, the Plymouth Draft Board and Bode's Restaurant.

"I remember watching the store burn from across the street on the post office steps," she said. "It was so cold that night. Everything was lost in the fire. Mary Parson's boy kept yelling, 'Mommy, look at my clothing store!' Over and over again. I can still hear his voice. Why, he must be over 30 years old now."

In the spring of that same year, the Chaikens bought competitor Margaret Dunning's shop on Forest Avenue. Minerva put the two business names together and

Minerva's Dunning's opened in October. "I guess what kept me in business all these years, and what still keeps me going, even though business isn't what it used to be, is my customers," Minerva explained over coffee and pineapple cake in the kitchen located in the back of the store. "I appreciate every one of them. Can the big stores say that? My sales staff knows just what to show a customer. And we let things go out on approval. We help people make selections they're satisfied with. If you let my sales staff wait on you, I guarantee you'll go out smiling."

Minerva said there could be no doubt that the opening of Laurel Park Place in Livonia and the expansion of other malls in the area hurt her business. She said she's lost the younger shoppers but holds tight to her "regulars" and people in town.

"I've got more inventory than I ever had," she said. "I know the store's fixtures are old and the store's decor is a little dated, but the merchandise is current. It's out front where it's easy to see. If my customer goes to a mall, she can't always find what she wants. She comes back to me saying, 'I knew you'd have it,' and we always do. Then they say, 'I hope you don't change.'"

Minerva buys her merchandise from manufacturer's representative's she's dealt with for decades. Sportswear is her biggest category. In the children's division, it's mostly grandmother's buying gifts for their grandchildren, look-

ing for classic styles and good quality. She prices brands like Alfred Dunner, Korset and Hanes competitively with two big sales a year. The fierce competition for shoppers these days has Minerva contemplating additional sales and a raffle for a leather handbag.

Sales staffers Helen Sorenson and Betty Campbell have been with Minerva for almost 20 years. As nine-year employee Arlene Trudeau explained, "We're like a family here."

In 1985, the mayor of Plymouth presented Minerva with a plaque commemorating her 35th anniversary. She displays it proudly while denying plans to retire or sell the store.

"I still feel I'm young enough to keep going," she said. Her wish is for downtown Plymouth to return to its glory days when there were five drugstores in town, a bustling hardware establishment, several places to buy shoes, and numerous groceries.

"It was so wonderful coming to work in the mornings back then," she said with a big smile. "People were sweeping their sidewalks and as you'd walk by, you'd exchange good mornings by name. That's what makes small towns so special."

Minerva, a resident of Livonia, still comes into work each day, though usually not until the afternoon hours. Store hours are Monday-Thursday 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Fridays 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Saturdays 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sundays for the holidays, noon to 5 p.m.

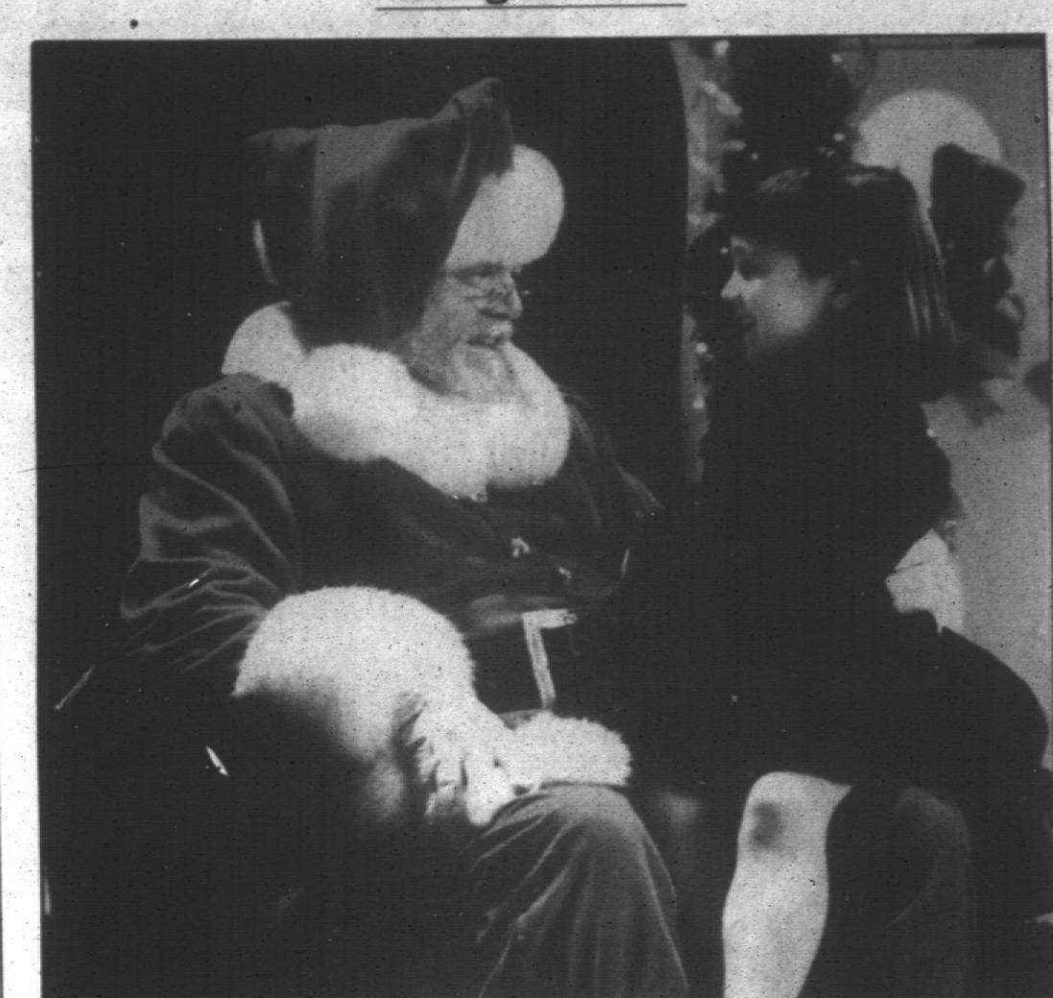

Chief surge buries Blazers



Livonia Ladywood had the home-court advantage and the revenge factor in its favor when it met Plymouth Canton in the girls basketball district final Friday. But it wasn't enough against the quicker, scrappier Chiefs.

There are two halves to every basketball game.

Sounds simple enough, but Livonia Ladywood discovered a whole new dimension to that lesson — the hard way — Friday night.

And it was Plymouth Canton that did the teaching. Trailing by a point at halftime, the Chiefs blitzed the Blazers with a 20-8 third quarter as they rolled to a 56-43 win in the Class A district basketball final hosted by Ladywood.

It was the second year in a row the Chiefs won a district title at Ladywood's expense.

Canton, now 16-6, advances to the Birmingham Seaholm regional where it will play Detroit Central (9-10 this season) at 7:30 p.m. Monday. The regional final is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Wednesday.

"I just said to them I thought we could score on them," Canton coach Bob Blohm said, describing his halftime talk. "I said we need to be patient, to get the ball in the high post, and to play good defense."

Nothing too enlightening in that speech, but something lit a fire under the Chiefs. Not that they had played poorly in the first half; it's just that they put on a performance that might qualify the third quarter as their finest of the season.

The Blazers, behind nine points from Becky Bilicki, were ahead at the half 23-22. They were more successful executing coach Lisa McPhee's game plan in the first two quarters. "I know how quick (the Chiefs) are," McPhee said. "I told the girls to be patient, to work the ball inside."

The mistake Ladywood made was

playing at the same level in the second half, while Canton turned its game up several notches.

In the first two minutes of the third quarter, the Blazers had three possessions — but just one shot (a miss). All three ended with a turnover.

The Chiefs had three baskets in four shots in that stretch, taking a lead they never relinquished. They added three more baskets by the time the period was half over and before Ladywood had scored. The Blazers had more turnovers (five) than shots (one) in that span.

Amicie Crayton and Sarah Warnke did most of the damage, scoring six points apiece as the Chiefs took a 42-31 advantage into the final eight minutes.

"I think both Sarah and Amicie are just great athletes," said Blohm. "They're quick to the ball, and they really jump well."

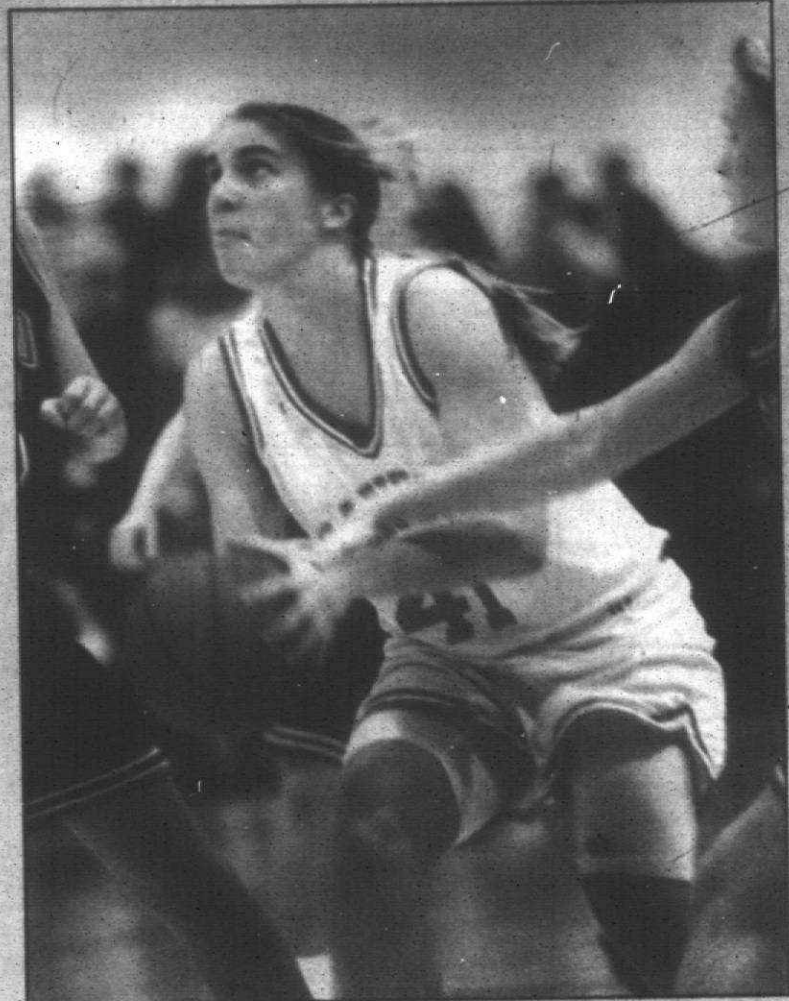
And they used those abilities to overwhelm a bigger Ladywood lineup that featured University of Michigan recruit Ann Foglits.

"Their size did concern me," said Blohm. "It really concerned me. But I thought our quickness neutralized their size."

Ladywood's McPhee agreed, acknowledging the speed in which Canton rotated the ball offensively and the Chiefs' defensive quickness. "Canton played with a lot of heart tonight," McPhee said. "Those kids work hard all the time on defense."

"We were not playing our game at all. Sometimes the kids come to play and sometimes they don't."

There was nothing the Blazers could do in the last quarter to overtake Canton. The closest they got

was nine, but Canton was good enough at the free-throw line (10-of-15 in the quarter) and did a better job rebounding.

Crayton paced the Chiefs with 19 points, converting 7-of-8 free throws (Canton finished 12-of-21 at the

line). Jackie Nicastrì scored 11 and Warnke had eight.

Bilicki's 13 points paced Ladywood; next highest was Erin LeSage with seven.

Injuries hamper Baker

When Tom Baker left Plymouth for the University of Virginia, he took with him confidence built on ability, ability enough to earn him a spot on the Parade All-American soccer team while he was at Plymouth Salem.

He was good, no question about it. Which is why he went to Virginia, the NCAA champion two of the three prior years. Twice named to the all-state team while at Salem, Baker's talent was summed up briefly by his high school coach, Ken Johnson:

"He's the best player Salem has ever had."

It was high praise, just as being named All-American was. It can be difficult to live up to such lofty expectations, but Baker's first year with the nation's best collegiate soccer program was a solid one.

Before Virginia opened its 1993 season, the Cavaliers' coach, Bruce Arena, told a Charlottesville newspaper that Baker would be in the starting lineup for that first game.

"Baker has been the most impressive first year (player)," Arena said. "He's extremely versatile ... a kid who's going to be hard to keep off the field."

But that was last year. It ended gloriously, with Virginia collecting its third NCAA title in four years. And Baker's future seemed secure.

Then came the injuries.

Three times in a year he sprained his left ankle. The last two came at the beginning of summer, then again at the end — just two weeks before Baker was to depart for Virginia to start his sophomore year.

Now the Cavaliers are in their customary position — a 17-3-1 record with another Atlantic Coast Conference championship to its credit, collected Nov. 13 with a 1-0 win over Duke in the final at Clemson. Next on the agenda: the NCAA Tournament, a familiar tour for Virginia. It began yesterday at home against the University of North Carolina-Greensboro.

The question: Where does Baker fit in?

His injured ankle (sprained during his Vardar club team's final match) cost him, no doubt. "I was not in the best of shape when I got here," Baker said.

And at Virginia, that's not a good position to be in. As Baker explained, "We have six or seven guys who played with the national team. (Arena) brings in one or two of them a year."

Which means there's a lot of competition for playing time, between players who brought credentials to Virginia at least equal to Baker's. "Everybody's fighting for their position," Baker said.

It was more than a month into the season before Baker's ankle was close to normal, and by then his

status with the team was changing.

"I kind of lost my confidence," he said. "I wasn't playing all that great, so he switched me."

A marking back most of the time since coming to Virginia, Baker started nine of 21 matches; he came in off the bench in seven others.

A highlight of his season was getting his first collegiate goal, Oct. 19 against Virginia Commonwealth. But other than his team's success, there haven't been many others this year.

"I'm not getting in as much time now as I was earlier in the year," said Baker. There's no bitterness, however; no alternate plans regarding relocation. "No, I like it here," Baker said. "It's a great school, with a great (soccer) program."

Which is what brought him to Virginia in the first place: "A combination of those two things," he said.

And it will keep him there, hopefully with two sound legs and a couple more NCAA titles supporting him.

Will to survive is premise for NBC's *Following Her Heart*

When Merry Helm wrote the script for *Following Her Heart*, she had Ann-Margret in mind for the lead.

The NBC movie, premiering Monday, Nov. 28, stars Ann-Margret as an emotionally abused wife, struggling to be her own person and gain her independence.

Ingalill Lundquist, Ann-Margret's character, is a Swedish woman who experiences a lot of hardships in her life, including a loveless marriage and an unsupportive and uncaring husband.

"She had a pre-arranged, marriage in Sweden when she was very young to a much, much older man," Ann-Margret comments. "And he was very cruel to her. Just very cold. And she thought that that was her lot in life."

It is evident from the beginning of the movie that Ingalill's husband, Anders, cares for his pet parakeet more than his own wife. The love that should have been hers is geared toward the bird instead.

Because of this lack of love, Ingalill turns to her first love - music. She dreams of a time when she can travel to Nashville to perform at the

Grand Ole Opry.

Ingalill also finds comfort in her only daughter, and in writing to her secret pen pal, Maisie.

"It's one of the secret things that she does, is to write to this woman who lives in Nashville, which her husband doesn't know about," director Lee Grant says. "It's her secret. It's her pen pal."

Only a small portion of *Following Her Heart* focuses on her painful and hard life with her husband. But it serves to establish the abuse that Ann-Margret's character has been through.

"She has always been a very courageous lady," Ann-Margret says. "But, she has been so deeply repressed and so horrendously frightened. She's not physically abused by her husband, but mentally and emotionally, he never gives her credit for being anything."

When her husband dies, Ingalill believes that now she can live her own life. Yet, even from the grave, her husband continues to ruin her life.

In his will, Anders leaves her financial affairs in the hands of Kenny, their daughter's husband. Kenny happens to be cut from the same

cloth as Anders. Immediately, he begins to run Ingalill's life, thus shattering her dreams again.

With newfound determination, Ingalill embarks on a journey to Nashville with a tour group to pursue her dream and rediscover herself.

"It is a literal journey, in terms of where she's going, and also an interior journey, in all the people and the kind of effect that they have on her," Grant comments. "The trip that she takes from North Dakota to Nashville on this bus tour is a kind of journey to revelation for her."

Through the people in the tour group, Ingalill looks at the woman she was before and the woman that she still could become.

Ingalill discovers that it is possible to love and still retain a sense of independence. She finds out that living life can be a wonderful experience.
