Observer names general manager

Steven K. Pope, a newspaper veteran of 21 years, has been appointed general manager of the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers.

The appointment was announced Friday by Richard Aginian, president of the Suburban Communications Corp., parent company of the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers.

From 1988-93, Pope served simultaneously as corporate vice president of Media News Group and as vice president of circulation and production of the Houston Post. Media News Group is a Houston-based publisher of 80 daily and weekly newspapers throughout the United States.

He previously held senior-level circulation management positions with daily newspapers in Santa Fe, Long Beach, Tucson, and Denver.

Pope currently is a newspaper consultant who has been serving as associate publisher of Metro Times, a Detroit-based weekly alternative newspaper.

"I'm extremely pleased that Steve will be joining us," said Aginian. "He emerged as our top candidate after a long and intense national search and has an outstanding record in newspaper operations."

When Pope assumes his position on Jan. 3, he will be responsible for the individual Observer and Eccentric publishing groups, as well as the central marketing, business, production, human resources, and computer operations of O&E Newspapers.

Pope succeeds Richard M. Brady, who has served as interim general manager since March. Brady will return to his post as corporate vice president of sales and marketing for Suburban Communications.

"Dick Brady has been wearing two hats for 10 months," said Aginian. "He agreed to serve as interim general manager until we found the right person for the permanent position. But Dick didn't think or act like a substitute. He brought his experience as a newspaperman to bear on the reorganization strategy that the O&E undertook last year."

Aginian credited Brady with building momentum for the strategy to "bring the O&E Newspapers closer to their readers and advertisers." He furthered the goal of distinguishing the Observer Group and the Eccentric Group from each other so that each would meet the needs of its respective market.

Aginian said Pope will continue to implement the community growth strategy developed last year.

Pope and wife Carolyn will relocate to a community within the O&E Newspaper market shortly after assuming his new responsibilities. The Popes have two daughters, Brandie, 13, and Susan, 10.

MEAP scores on rise in schools



Results of a state standardized test are back, and Plymouth-Canton school officials are happy with the numbers. Approximately eight of 10 students did well in math.

Plymouth-Canton school officials are pleased with scores on the Michigan Educational Assessment Program, a standardized math, reading and science test students took in the fall.

In reading, roughly eight of 10 stu-

dents scored in the satisfactory or moderate category, said community relations director Dick Egli, who released the scores late Friday. "Overall this year, scores for students continue to improve," he said.

Results indicate that 81 percent of the fourth graders, 83 percent of seventh-graders and 90 percent of 10th-

graders scored in the top two-thirds. The numbers were similar in math. Eighty-eight percent of fourth-graders, 94 percent of seventh-graders and 82 percent of 10th-graders scored in the top two-thirds.

In science, 85 percent of fifth-graders, 77 percent of eighth-graders and 59 percent of 11th-graders passed. Ninety-six percent of 11th-graders qualified for a state-endorsed diploma.

"These results are one tool and only one tool we use to determine an individual student's specific strengths and specific areas of need,"

said Dr. Thomas Tattan, executive director/instruction. "They are a means to view an individual student's performance on this state-mandated test, and help identify the students' instructional needs so that they can best be met to make future educational progress. The most important assessment of student progress, however, is what takes place daily between the teacher and the student in the classroom."

Kathryn Harenda, Plymouth-Canton curriculum coordinator, said the MEAP scores "show a positive trend

Residents question wetland development

Century Farms residents long had more than an inkling that they live next to a wetland even though a developer has been eyeing the land for a shopping center.

"We noticed it is constantly wet all year-round. Kids skate on it. Rushes get to be six feet high. In the spring, a lot of pheasants and ducks breed there," said Bob Whiteaker, homeowners association president.

Residents decided to get a definitive answer from the state Department of Natural Resources. Sure enough, the land on the corner of Haggerty and Palmer is considered a wetland protected under state law.

But the DNR does not specify if all the acreage or only a portion is protected as a wetland. "I'm never surprised when the DNR says there is a regulated wetland here," said Judy Bocklage, township associate planner. "This is the ancient Lake

Erie. Ridge Road is where the shoreline was."

Resident Gail Bowers requested the DNR check. "She borders it. She was one of the original residents of this subdivision. The letter from the DNR, we feel, shows that the residents have a concern about anything being built there. There is a situation there with the wetlands that needs to be addressed," Whiteaker said.

Residents have opposed proposed plans by developer Sam Arabbo for a

shopping plaza called Century Commons. They also met with Arabbo and township officials to develop alternatives. Arabbo did not return the Observer's inquiry.

"They are still trying to proceed," said Bocklage, about Arabbo and his associates. "But we haven't received a revised plan."

Whiteaker said residents assume the land eventually will be developed.

Harvard Square shopping center spruced up

Streetscape improvements along Ford Road prompted renovations at the Harvard Square shopping center at Ford and Sheldon roads.

"I thought the center needed an update," said Art Sills, center owner. "The Downtown Development Authority project was the catalyst for this."

The approximately \$1.7 million DDA streetscape project along Ford,

from Sheldon Road to Morton Taylor, includes a brick wall, improved sidewalks, decorative lighting and landscaping. The project also includes improvements in the Harvard Square shopping center's parking lot. The brick wall and landscaping go north on Sheldon along Harvard Square, as well.

"When the design was done, improvements in the parking lot were wanted. It was included in the landscape easement granted by Art Sills,"

said Angela Wolosiewicz, DDA project coordinator.

When renovations are complete, the buildings, including Kroger north to Arbor Drugs, will boast neutral tones trimmed in teal. A three-step plaster-type material will cover where brick now decorates exterior walls. Lighting under the canopy will be improved. The buildings also will be given additional height, Sills said.

"It should look interesting," Sills said. "The signs on the buildings will

be the same except for two of them — Radio Shack and D.O.C. will have individually illuminated signs."

Harvard Square also is expected to get a new restaurant, Country Kitchen Buffet, in 10,000 square feet next to Arbor Drugs. "That will give the center an added bonus," Sills said.

The only remaining vacancy in the shopping center is where a pet supply store used to be immediately north of

Seeking help

Teen prepares for double-lung transplant

Greg Unger of Canton wants to be like all the other kids his age. But he and his family are preparing for his planned double-lung transplant.

"Of course we are biased. But we think Greg is a very special boy," said his dad, Bill Unger of Mount Clemens.

Greg, 14, his dad and mom, Barbara of Canton, have asked for help from Children's Organ Transplant Association to raise about \$100,000 for the medical costs as well as costs to relocate the family to St. Louis where the procedure will be performed.

Greg was diagnosed at 6 months of age with cystic fibrosis, a genetic disease that primarily attacks the respiratory and digestive systems. Cystic fibrosis produces an abnormal accumulation of mucus in the lungs and other organs that can suffocate and starve the victim.

"It's a terminal illness," Bill Unger said. "Greg is still in school. He just got over a bout of infection. He is on oxygen at

night. He's just making it at school, trying to keep up."

But Greg is like other kids. He is an avid collector of sports cards, particularly hockey and even more particularly the Detroit Red Wings. He also plays the keyboard. Greg has worked with the Make-A-Wish Foundation. "His wish was to go to the shopping mall. And he rode there in a limo," his father said.

Greg's prognosis is poor. Without the transplant, he might not survive another 18 months, Unger said.

COTA hosted an organizational meeting for Greg's effort Dec. 8 in Novi.

"We're going to have a planning meeting in the third week of January. Hopefully, everyone will come with their (fund-raising) ideas," Unger said, adding that tickets will be available then for a raffle.

Already \$6,000 has been raised through a baked goods sale and private donations. "What I like is that dollar for dollar it all goes to Greg," Unger said.

COTA plans a number of fund-raising events, including raffles, and 250 donation canisters throughout the metropolitan area.

The 100 percent tax-deductible donations may be mailed to National Bank of Detroit, 45345 Ford Road, Canton, 48187. Donations also may be made in person at any NBD branch. Checks or money orders should be made payable to "COTA For Greg." Please remember to write account number 215080176914 in the memo space of checks.

"Right now, Greg is on the inactive list," Unger said, referring to the transplant list. "Once he is activated, hopefully, we'll be near the top."

Bill Unger has already received a job transfer to St. Louis. Barbara Unger will take a leave of absence from her job. The family plans to be there by July 1 if not before. "We'll get a six-hour notice once organs are located," Unger said.

The Ungers are working with UNOS, a federally funded organization that coordinates organ donations and recipients. COTA

is a federally recognized national charity dedicated to organizing and guiding families and communities to raise money for transplants or transplant-related expenses.

"COTA's priority is to assure that no individual is denied a transplant or excluded from a transplant waiting list due to a lack of funds," according to Mike Miller of COTA.

Greg was evaluated at Children's Hospital in St. Louis. "We wanted another opinion," Unger said. "So we went to Pittsburgh. We got the same opinion."

While Greg knows what's ahead of him, he is concerned that he is not viewed any differently than his classmates or friends. "He basically just wants to be a normal kid. His position is that he has kept his feelings inside," Unger said.

Teachers expected to ratify new contract

Plymouth-Canton's 744 teachers were expected to ratify by today a contract agreement reached last week with the Board of Education.

"I'd be very surprised if it didn't pass. It should pass by quite a bit," said Tom Cotner, chief negotiator for the teachers, who had tentatively planned to strike Jan. 16.

Teachers will receive a 2-percent raise effective in January 1995, a 2-percent raise in August 1995, and a 1-percent increase in January 1996. Teachers' co-pay for prescriptions will go from \$2 to \$5.

"I'm happy it's over," Cotner said. "We were realistic about the plight of public education in Michigan, and specifically in Plymouth. (Superintendent) Dr. (Charles) Little is right; not everything is equal among districts. But we have to live within our means."

"We addressed both our needs, which is what you try to do. It'll probably take a while before both sides are happy, but we got it done," he said.

Terms of the contract were presented to teachers at a general membership meeting Thursday. Teachers voted in school buildings Friday and today. The board is set to ratify the agreement at tonight's meeting.

Chuck Portelli, president of the Plymouth-Canton Education Association, was confident the will be ratified. "People are pleased. I think it is a fair settlement for both the board and for teachers," he said.

Fred Libbing, a counselor at Canton High School, has been with the district 34 years. "On the one hand, I think to fight as hard as we did for less than the cost of living is a little bit difficult to accept, especially when the governor gets 4 percent just handed to him by the commission."

"Having said that, circumstances are such that in our country, society and economy,

I'm quite happy and appreciative to have a contract, with all the downsizing and give-backs in industry. I'm pleased Dr. Little was able to help resolve the conflict. It's a real tough thing for a person like that to come into a new district and deal with a massive labor problem. It makes it much more likely that he'll be able to accomplish the educational refinements and advancements he wants in the district."

Portelli said teachers looked at both sides of the issue. "They understand what it does to them economically. They also know the position it places them in the county. That's a concern."

Plymouth-Canton teachers are paid less than their counterparts in Novi, Livonia, Allen Park, Garden City and Farmington, he said.

Nonetheless, "teachers are assisting the district by being paid at semester."

It stands to reason that the best new hires may look to other higher-paying districts for jobs, he added.

District spokesman Richard Egli said he's pleased with the expected contract approval, calling it "a product of good negotiation."

"It provides a solid base to continue the focus on the important things in education and the learning that's taking place by our students," he said. While

"any financial picture certainly is up for guessing at this point, projections are that we will be able to continue education and live within this contract."

While teachers may be able to earn more elsewhere, "There is certainly more to teaching than just a paycheck," Egli said. "We have some outstanding facilities, outstanding staff members, and positive attitudes. As long as those elements are here, I expect we will have an abundance of applicants. Having said that, I also recognize that in this day and age, we need to remain competitive in what we are offering potential employees, as well as our current employees."

Maintenance workers study four-year contract

Custodial workers in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools can put aside fears of the district privatizing maintenance services. Over the weekend, the 120-member union was expected to approve a four-year contract agreement reached with the district last week.

Food service, transportation, paraprofessionals and the administrators' association remain unsettled.

The maintenance pact provides for a zero increase for 1993-94 - covering the period

employees worked without a contract - a zero percent for 1994-95; 2-percent increase in 1995-96; and a 1-percent raise in 1996-97 with a wage re-opener.

Maintenance workers' co-pay will go from \$2 to \$5.

"I think this works out well for everyone," said union official Chris Gears. "What held this up all along was the fact we had a hard time going in front of the bargaining unit, looking them in the eye and asking them for things to save money to benefit students when we knew the district was going to spend it on hiring additional administration."

The board recently considered, and denied, an administrative proposal to hire a \$50,000 maintenance supervisor at the high schools.

The district will cut costs with a new entry-level pay step.

New hires in custodial-maintenance have been paid \$12.86 per hour. Starting pay will decrease to \$9.36, increasing to \$9.72 after 90 days. Employees will receive an additional holiday this year and next, to be taken when school is out. They'll also receive a fourth personal day, also to be taken when school is out.

Maintenance employees will now be eligible to receive compensatory time in lieu of overtime.

"We have received time-and-a-half on Saturdays, and double time on Sundays," said Gears. "So if we're required to work one of those days, we will have a choice of additional compensation time. Use of this time will be discouraged when school is in session to try and save funds."

Also in the package is a retirement bonus. Employees retiring prior to July 1 will receive \$3,000. Those retiring in July of 1996 will receive \$2,000. The following July, \$1,000 will be paid.

In addition, an "operations committee" consisting of eight custodial-maintenance employees and eight individuals appointed by the superintendent will meet to make recommendations for improvements. The committee will receive a \$5,000 allotment. "The committee can choose to allot people bonuses for suggestions based on how constructive the idea is," Gears said.

A suggestion box will be placed in the board office. "We're happy with this agreement. I think it's good for students in the district, considering the financial uncertainty facing

us right now," Gears said. "I think it will leave additional funds to be diverted to the classroom. That's my prime concern, and it will be key to every employee's success in this district."

There's been concern statewide about privatization, especially at Plymouth-Canton where food service is privatized, he added. "It's been a concern. But privatization isn't all it's cracked up to be. I don't think we will see a lot of districts plunging into it," Gears said.

The board is expected to ratify the agreement at tonight's meeting.

Speakers put spotlight on health topics

"I feel there is not enough education for the public regarding health care," said Potter of the Canton Center Chiropractic Clinic on Ford Road.

To try to get the word out, Potter two years ago formed the Doctor's Speakers Bureau. It includes a team of local doctors and other health care professionals who by request will provide health care awareness with

speakers and health fairs.

The no-charge service is provided to schools, civic and labor organizations, industry, social groups, churches, clubs and companies.

"We wanted to keep it local. I chose doctors who work within the local community," Potter said. "We thought about what people might not know about regarding health care."

Doctors who are involved in the speaker's bureau are Dr. Dario Merlo, a dentist, Dr. Tom Cassidy, an optometrist, Dr. James Bahdan, an optometrist,

and Dr. Robert Lubin, a podiatrist.

Other health care professionals, such as massage therapists and nurses who conduct cholesterol and blood pressure screenings, also help, said Kathy Page, chiropractic administrative assistant.

"We talk about preventive medicine and different aspects of health care. It is different than conventional medicine," Potter said. "We have different ways of treating and preventing problems. But we are not here to discourage people from getting

health matters taken care of in a proper manner."

Topics the doctors will speak about include stress, headaches, bifocal contacts, proper foot care, advances in dentistry, vitamin and nutritional information, sports and pediatric vision, radiology and back care.

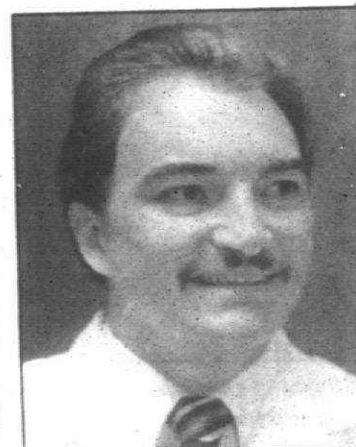
"If consumers are informed, they can make an intelligent decision," said Potter, who is also a nutritional therapist. "People don't realize there are alternatives."

Potter, who has been in practice eight years, five of which

have been in Canton, believes that good nutrition helps the body help itself. "There's a lot that can be done just from a nutritional point of view."

Potter personally will speak to groups about headaches, back care, stress and health and antioxidants - vitamins A, C and E. "I like to look at them as the secret service of the body," Potter said.

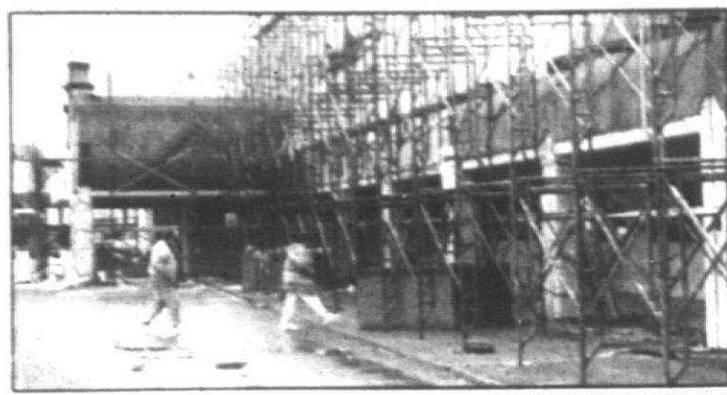

Kroger. Sills said patrons can expect renovations in North Harvard Square next year.

Township officials say changes in facades and other improvements to businesses along the commercial corridor as a by-product of the DDA streetscape.

"I think the DDA is doing what we thought it would do: creating energy and excitement on properties in and outside the DDA," said Canton Supervisor Tom Yack.

The owners of New Towne plaza, which was expanded and renovated a couple years ago, also recently built a brick wall — similar to the DDA wall — at the center's entrances on Ford Road. The owners of the Rusty Nail bar on the south side of Ford Road, just west of Marlowe, have

added new shrubbery, while work is continuing with the removal of one parking island and the addition of others at the Canton Cinema Six.

Construction crews are wrapping up the DDA project with limestone caps on the brick wall, as well as a little more sidewalk that must be finished. Man hurt in rollover accident

It's believed the fire was caused by careless smoking. The houses were not damaged. Construction workers were attempting to put out the fire when firefighters arrived and finished the job.

WOMAN HURT

A 39-year-old Northville woman was taken to Ann Arbor Hospital with possible leg injuries after she lost control of her car while traveling on Michigan Avenue, east of Lilley, at 10:45 p.m. Nov. 25.

The woman was traveling east on Michigan when she lost control, crossed over the median and across the westbound lanes of traffic. She came to a stop in a vacant lot. Her car also was damaged.

OVERHEATED FURNACE

Firefighters responded to a smoke call in a unit of the Plymouth Landing Condominiums on Northumberland at 5:27 a.m. Nov. 26.

The owner's smoke detector alerted him to a problem. He discovered that his furnace was overheating. He turned off the furnace fan but the burner continued to operate.

When firefighters arrived they managed to turn off the furnace and used fans to ventilate the building. They also checked the attic and walls for fire.

Firefighters urge homeowners to turn off their furnaces if they notice them overheating.

At 5:33 p.m. the first unit that transported the elderly man at Canton Place returned to transport the boyfriend charged in hurting his girlfriend at Sherwood Mobile Home Park about a half-hour earlier. The man was transported from the Canton Police Department. The man had been beating his head against the windows of the police patrol car and in the jail cell.

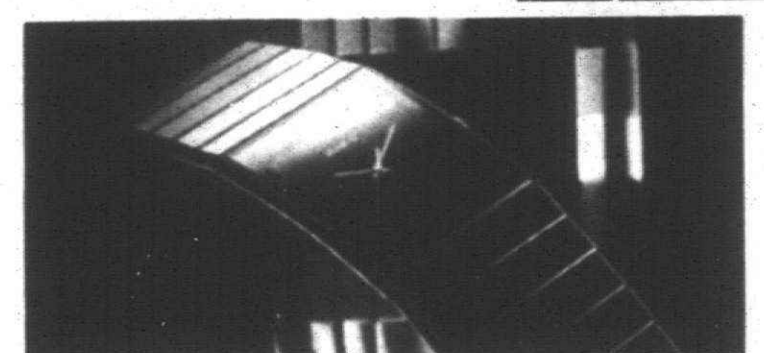

House to vote on assisted suicide

The showdown vote on banning assisted suicide will come this week in the state House of Representatives' lame-duck session.

The Senate Wednesday gave the bill 26-9 approval, as expected. Unlike a 1992 version which expired in mid-November, the new measure, Senate Bill 1311, would be a permanent addition to the criminal code.

"We need to protect the vulnerable from unwittingly becoming victims of assisted suicide," said Sen. Fred Dillingham, R-Fowlerville, sponsor of the new measure, SB 1311. Backers of the ban want to keep a live law in front of the state Supreme Court as it argues the constitutionality of making the assisting of a suicide a four-year felony. Their sword target is Jack Kevorkian, the retired West Bloomfield pathologist who already has assisted 21 terminally ill people in ending their lives.

The Legislature's 1992 ban on

assisted suicide was struck down in lower courts for being unconstitutionally adopted.

The Senate shot down amendments by Sen. Jim Berryman, D-Adrian, to regulate assisted suicide. It also rejected an effort by Sen. Lana Pollack, D-Ann Arbor, to place the question before voters.

Here is how area senators voted on passage of SB 1311:

YES — Robert Geake, R-Northville, George Z. Hart, D-Deerborn.

NO — William Faust, D-Westland.

Senators waxed eloquent during Wednesday's debate.

Jack Faxon: "In the last 20 or 30 years, modern medicine has

prolonged life. We heard before that there was some God-like vision that came down and said, 'Thou shalt have a respirator.' And there was another vision that came down and said, 'Thou shalt have dialysis.' ... Whose life is it anyway? Everywhere I go, people think they own their own bodies — in spite of what the Michigan Senate has said."

Pollack: "I am angry especially because this Legislature refuses to give up control over something that is not properly ours. We were elected to serve as senators, not to serve as God. Let the public make their own decisions. ... When my colleagues say that people are only depressed, I say that per-

haps if you had no arms, no legs, no sight and the only way to control pain was to dope you into semi-consciousness, you might have a depression that was reality-based."

Dillingham: "Emotions will drive you in one way on this issue, but I do know we need to protect the vulnerable from being abused and unwittingly becoming victims of assisted suicide. And you simply cannot legislate that protection without banning the practice entirely." He said Michigan had passed landmark laws on pain management.

On the Berryman amendment, Dillingham quoted the New England Journal of Medicine as saying Oregon faces problems with its law allowing assisted suicide: "This may not satisfy the federal regulations governing prescription drugs. The types of drugs that would be prescribed for this lethal purpose are likely to be those that are regulated under the federal Controlled Substances Act."

Lawmaker office funds voted out of existence

Michigan legislators will end their practice of maintaining "officeholder expense funds" in a year.

The Legislature also passed a "Doug Cruce law," prohibiting lawmakers who resign in mid-term to become lobbyists during their term of office. It was so dubbed because Cruce, R-Troy, left the Senate in spring of 1991 to take a higher-paid job as president of the Michigan Insurance Federation.

"None of the freshmen had OEFs," said Rep. Dan Gustafson, R-Williamston, the freshmen who sponsored House Bill 4837 to stop them. "Other lawmakers spent down or closed their OEFs."

Under the bill, which passed the Senate overwhelmingly and is on its way to Gov. John Engler's desk, lawmakers may spend whatever is left, give it to a non-profit group, transfer it to a campaign committee (if the OEF contained no corporate money) or use it to retire a debt.

The House concurred 98-0 in Senate amendments. All area lawmakers voted yes except the absent Justice Burns, D-Westland, Penny Crissman, R-Rochester, and Richard Young, D-Deerborn Heights.

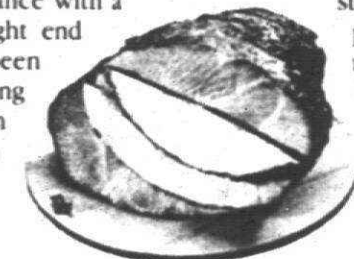
Senate majority leader Dick Posthumus, R-Alto, praised the "bi-partisan, bicameral, four-bill legislative ethics package that makes the most comprehensive changes to current lobby and campaign finance law in several years."

Besides the Gustafson OEF bill, the package contains:

- SB 1319 which lowers to \$501 the threshold at which lobbyists must report spending on trips and gifts to legislators (effective Jan. 1, 1995).
- HB 4371 which bans all cash honoraria for legislators. It is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 or 90 days in jail (effective Jan. 1, 1995).
- HB 4325, which bans resigning lawmakers from becoming lobbyists or lobbying agents during the term of which to which they were elected (effective Jan. 1, 1995).

Kids may now write to 'Santa' on the Internet

Santa Claus now has an e-mail address. So children of the '90s who don't want to telephone Santa or drop send him a letter through snail-mail, can access Kris Kringle via the Internet.

This week I had really wanted to discuss the World Wide Web (WWW), but because Christmas is almost here, and the kids will want to talk with Santa now instead of after I will interrupt my sched-

Actual Santa does have a residence on the Web and so today's column is an indirect introduction to my planned topic. A back-

door path, of sorts.

Just like there are several telephone numbers the little ones can use to call Santa, and just like Santa chooses to visit several shopping malls instead of just one, Santa also has chosen to establish residences at several hosts on the Internet. Surely by now kids are used to this multiplicity of Santa and can handle the diversity.

To visit the Northpole via O&E On-line, users will want to use Lynx which is the tool our system uses to access WWW. To do this, from the main menu type P for Program. For Internet, and then 1 for Lynx. For each visit, we will want to choose our own Home Page and will select Option 2 to do that. At the prompt we will type the Universal Resource Locator (URL) designation of http which stands for

hypertext protocol. If I get into that now there won't be a column for next week, so we won't worry about hypertext.

Santa can be visited at the North Pole using a route provided by CityLink. To do that, at the Lynx prompt accessed above, type: <http://www.northeast.com/citylink/xmas/default.html>. Upon arrival, you will be offered a "Letter from Santa" which you can customize for your child. Download it, load it into your word processor, substitute your child's name for (Child's Name), and print it out. At CityLink's North Pole you also will find Santa's Christmas Favorites, a gift catalog full of suggestions for mom, dad, sister, etc. Pick out a scarf or clock and pay by credit card. I believe it's this site that also includes a collection of Christmas recipes including one

for gingerbread cookies.

Santa also can be reached by: <http://www.northpole.net>. Upon arrival is a message from Santa, the Elves, and Rudolph. And for only \$5 you can order an "I e-mailed Santa" button to wear to school and impress other kids.

Contact also can be made with Santa by typing <http://northpole.org>. One of the early options available is the "Cyberspace Christmas Campaign." Select this option and find lists of worthy causes that need donations during Christmas time. I have been told that there are corporate sponsors who will donate a dime for every time a user visits a Homepage of one of these charities.

At this site, you can look up some recipes from Rudolph. "A

tasty concoction of the best from the frozen tundra. Rudolph says the green alimex moss works the best. He mixes in the exotic taste of ginger and penguin feathers to create a true taste treat." Another selection is "Digital Christmas Tree." Choose this option and you will be offered a variety of trees and ornaments to download.

At each site, after going to particular area such as Christmas recipes, use the left arrow key to return to the previous screen. Typing Q will take you away from the North Pole and back to the Lynx site. Use the down arrow key to move from one highlighted text option to another, and hit RETURN to select that choice. (Oops, now I'm writing next week's column).

If your little one is literate and would like to send Santa a letter via e-mail, here are some addresses that can be used: santa@newlink13.com or santa@northpole.net.

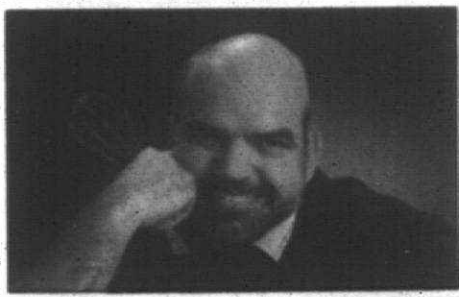

Curl up with the best new cookbooks

It never ceases to amaze me that there are people who have time to write cookbooks. What amazes me even more is that many of these books get published.

Publishers spend megabucks to make sure foodies like me get a copy, and hope for a positive review. Since the first of the year, I have received well over 400 different cookbooks. I can name the best simply by counting the fingers on one hand.

Even if it was the last cookbook on earth, I would see no reason whatsoever to shell out \$20 for a 155 page cookbook entitled "In the Kitchen with Bob" who is, as he proclaims, "the host of QVC's enormously popular cooking show."

I watch television and I've never heard of QVC, let alone someone by the name of Bob Bowersox.

Then there are respected cookbook authors like James McNair who also penned a 159 page cookbook that sells for \$24.95. His tome, entitled "James McNair Cooks Italian," has a recipe calling for five cups of "fresh young herb leaves or sprigs such as basil, borage, lemon balm, burnet and arugula in addition to one cup of pesticide-free edible flowers such as daylily petals."

I ask you dear readers, where in metro Detroit can you find borage and burnet, or a cup of pesticide free daylily petals? Since McNair's cookbook also includes dramatic photographs of the prepared recipes, I figure there are about 100 recipes in his book, so to see James McNair cook Italian, it's costing you a quarter a recipe.

I've gotten much better recipes, from the buck I send to an anonymous P.O. box in the back of "Bon Appetit" magazine. But enough of the negative, there were a few books that did cross my desk that have earned a respected slot on my shelves.

Homemade treats

If you cook and like to give out homemade delicacies, especially during the holidays, you must pick up "Homemade in the Kitchen" by Barry Bluestein and Kevin Morrissey (Viking Books, \$24.95). This turn-of-the-century cookbook for the 1990s is a source book for discovering the kitchen arts of past generations.

With this book you will learn how to bottle Victorian catsups from scratch; how to bottle delectable cordials without a basement distillery, and how to transform a humble bottle of vinegar into a coveted addition to the pantry or gift basket.

When you call or write me with food questions, I have an arsenal of "how to" cookbooks within arm's reach that never go out of style. This year's top informational cookbooks are shared by four writers who leave little to question. Maria Josefa Lloria De O'Higgins, "A Taste of Old Cuba" (Harper/Collins \$25) contains more than 150 authentic and traditional Cuban dishes. Filled with stories and interesting anecdotes, this topped my list of the best ethnic books. I love paella and the recipe from the book is nothing short of stellar.

Great reads

Irena Chalmers, culinary humorist and cookbook curmudgeon has a great read with her "Great Food Almanac" (Collins Publishers \$25). This is a book for folks who like to read and enjoy a feast of facts from A to Z all with regards to the world of food. Chock full of hot-lines, informational sources, mail order goodies and the type of information one would share on a bar stool, it's just plain fun to read. The recipe for Tapenade (black olive caviar) is to die for.

The folks at Pillsbury have put together a great book entitled "Healthy Baking" (Viking Press \$22.95) that includes fresh approaches to more than 200 favorite recipes. In addition to an exorbitant nutritional breakdown of each recipe, I even found a healthy grain bread that you can make in your bread machine, that tastes good to boot!

A little closer to home, the folks at HP Books have discovered the expertise of Toula Patsalis from Kitchen Glamour fame and printed up her Pressure Cooker Cookbook (HP Books \$12) If you own a pressure cooker or anticipate a future purchase this is the authoritative source on everything you can make in a pressure cooker. Try the South of the Border Black Bean Soup, a Janes Gang favorite recipe, which cooks in 45 minutes from start to finish with a pressure cooker.

CAVIAR

■ Though often thought of as an expensive food for the wealthy, this delicacy can be found at more affordable prices. An ounce of caviar is enough to give a good sampling to four people.

If you have the idea that caviar is always an expensive food for the wealthy, associated with status and luxury celebrations or trendy restaurants, read on. Here's everything you need to know about this delicacy that has its special niche in the world of gastronomy. You may find prices more affordable than you thought. An ounce of caviar gives four people a good sampling.

Worldwide, caviar is garnering more advocates. This interest is occurring at a time when the traditional source, the prized eggs of the Caspian Sea sturgeon may be endangered. Only 15 years ago, the Soviet Union was exporting 2,000 tons of fish roe annually. Last year, it dropped to 190 tons of Caspian Sea caviar.

The Soviet Union's collapse gave rise to poachers in the Caspian Sea, home to 90 percent of the world's sturgeon and 95 percent of the world's supply of black caviar. Under governance by the former Soviet Union, strict fishing quotas during sturgeon spawning season were enforced. Netting was forbidden.

Without controls, widespread poaching and netting by newly independent fishermen from Zerbaijan, Kazakhstan and Turkmenistan became commonplace. Sturgeon, which mature between 5 and 20 years old, were caught before they returned to spawning rivers. It was not a good time to be a sturgeon because it seemed that new, weak governments were doing little to stop abuses until rules were again enforced about six months ago.

Poachers lacked skills to process caviar properly. It was imported after poor handling and some was inedible. Immature roe that

HOW TO SERVE CAVIAR

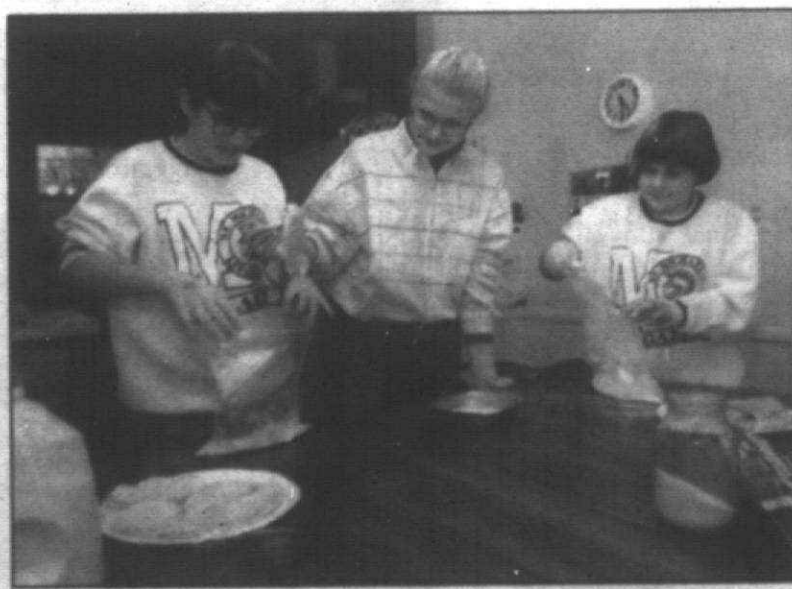
Place caviar in a small glass bowl set inside a larger bowl filled with crushed ice and serve from a non-metal spoon. Any metal, including silver, will impart a metallic flavor to the berries.

Serve with a glass of delicate style Brut champagne such as Taittinger Brut La Francaise or a 1.5 oz. pour of ice-chilled premium vodka such as Stolichnaya or Tanqueray Sterling. The best Russian caviar should be eaten without any accompaniment of sour cream, chopped eggs or onions. Dressing up less-prized caviars can enhance enjoyment. The following are only a few suggestions:

- Create shaped toasts and place golden-colored salmon caviar on one half and black caviar on the other.
- Carve out small baby red potatoes with a melon baller. Fill with sour cream and top with caviar.
- Top mini-size potato pancakes with sour cream and caviar.
- Top broiled oysters or clams with caviar before serving.

There's a whole lot of giggling going on in this Livonia kitchen. But don't be fooled. Some serious dinner preparations are in the making: one dozen breaded pork chops, a tossed salad, mashed potatoes (the real ones!), corn and applesauce.

Thirteen-year-old Margaret Day, an honors student, takes charge when mom and dad, Pat and Bob Day, are working. Her two sisters, Kathy, 11 years-old and also an honor roll student and 8-year-old Stephanie provide important roles as assistant chefs. The three girls attend St. Michael's School in Livonia.

"I usually brown the pork chops and Kathy and Stephanie do the breading," said Margaret.

The three-step assembly line breading process begins on the kitchen table. Stephanie, with streaks of powder-white through her bangs and sticky flour-caked fingers enjoys her "hands-on" assignment. She shakes the plastic bag with the pork chop in it until the flour coat-

ing smother the meat.

"I help because it would take Margaret a really long time. Besides it's fun and (the pork chops) taste good," said Stephanie.

Step number two, dipping the floured pork chop into an egg and milk mixture is meticulously done by Kathy. Next the chops are coated with cracker crumbs. Kathy also peels the potatoes.

Margaret adds oil to the frying pan, heats it and browns the chops before baking them in the oven.

Other favorite meals the family prepares?

"I like to make tuna burgers," said Margaret.

Everyone enjoys the combination of tuna, American cheese, boiled eggs, celery, mayonnaise and pickled relish baked on a bun.

Who appreciates the dinner the most?

"Probably mom," says Margaret. The girls have helped in the kitchen since first or second grade.

flooded the market and was being sold as premium caviar last year and earlier this year is not likely this holiday season. This is especially true if you purchase from a reputable merchant. Farmington Hills caviar broker Larry Nagle said. His Russian Caviar Company, which began in 1991 with local distribution of about 300 cans, has now gone national distributing fresh and pasteurized Russian caviar through beverage distributors. Sales are up 30 percent over last year.

Russian Caviar Co.'s caviar can be purchased at Cloverleaf Market in Southfield and Shopping Center Market in West Bloomfield. Cloverleaf sells the Beluga at \$38 an ounce and Osetra at \$26 an ounce. Pasteurized is \$31 for 3.25oz. "We guarantee satisfaction with these caviars," Cloverleaf's Paul Lufy said.

These remarks were echoed by caviar fanatic and industry watchdog Bruce Sobol, co-owner with his brother Eric of Manhattan Caviar. "Dozens of little companies pop up each year and then disappear," he said. "Caviar has been around since the 1940s when my father founded the company. Our image depends on the highest quality and service."

When Sobol learns about a new company, his vigilante instincts are aroused and he has an employee purchase some of the caviar so he can taste it. "The sale of inferior caviar hurts all premium caviar sales," he said.

Caviar is America's largest caviar-selling operation with a booming mail-order business. "There were some problems after the Soviet Union breakup," Sobol said. "During the last year, much of what papers and magazines reported about pollution was a scape tactic. With fishing laws enforced again, we now have more opportunities to choose the best caviar. We can ask processors to do a thing our way. We shop around and sometimes get lower prices than before the breakup of the Soviet Union."

For nearly 70 years, the Petrosian family has been selecting caviar directly from the fisheries on the Caspian Sea. Petrosian is the largest buyer and importer of Russian caviar to France, the United States and Canada. Locally, Merchant of Vino is the exclusive broker.

The Merchant's John Jonna quoted the following prices per ounce for Petrosian: \$65 for Beluga, \$38 for Osetra and \$28 for Sevraga sold only at the Birming-

ham and Southfield locations. American sturgeon caviar from an east coast supplier is also available for \$12 to \$35 an ounce and East Russian caviar for \$20 to \$49 an ounce.

Understanding Russian caviar

Basically, there are three species of prized sturgeon in the Caspian Sea. Because you like caviar from one, does not mean that you will like all of them.

Beluga is the most touted and therefore the most expensive. It is harvested from sturgeon averaging 800 to 900 pounds. These are the largest eggs with the most delicate flavors.

Osetra is characterized by gray-brown eggs with a golden tinge and a strong, almost nutty flavor. It comes from 250 to 600 pound sturgeons.

Sevraga with the smallest eggs is the least expensive. Gray to black in color with a strong flavor, it comes from sturgeon that mature in five years.

The important term uniting all top quality caviar is the word Malossol. This is the light treatment with salt allowing caviar flavors to perk the palate while retaining freshness for up to three months. "All fresh caviars are Malossol," Sobol said. He also suggested the best tasting order for the uninitiated is Beluga, Sevraga, then Osetra.

American Caviar

There's no bigger proponent of American caviar than Carolyn Collins of Chicago-based Carolyn Collins Caviar Co. Her company, founded in 1983, has attracted the attention of such clients as the Ritz-Carlton where we caught up with her. Mail orders for her caviars are brisk.

Collins, a sports fishing enthusiast, created an original technique to make her salmon and trout roes and has secured the Great Lakes to find whitefish and sturgeon suppliers. She has gone beyond traditional caviar and designed flavored ones which she calls "expanded concepts." In this vein, she's created Caviar Pepper and Citron, infused with Absolut Pepper and Citron. There's also Ginger, Midori, Grand Passion (all \$3.30 an ounce) and Wasabi Tobiko (\$4.50 an ounce). Kosher caviars are also available.

When we conducted a small caviar tasting, including those produced by Carolyn Collins, people who were not caviar connoisseurs preferred the infused. Caviar af-

cionados liked the Collins fresh water salmon (\$5.10 an ounce), farm raised trout (\$5.10 an ounce) and American blackback sturgeon (\$9.35 an ounce).

Serving caviar

Place caviar in a small glass bowl set inside a larger bowl filled with crushed ice and serve from a non-metal spoon. Any metal, including silver, will impart a metallic flavor to the berries.

Serve with a glass of delicate style Brut champagne such as Taittinger Brut La Française or a 1.5 liter bottle of sparkling wine or champagne such as Stolichnaya or Tanqueray Sterling.

HOMEMADE COFFEE LIQUEUR

2 cups strong ground fresh coffee beans (French roast)
3 cups boiling water
1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
1/2 cup light brown sugar, firmly packed
1 teaspoon glycerin
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
3 cups vodka

Put the coffee grounds and the boiling water into a bowl and mix thoroughly. Line a fine mesh sieve with a coffee filter and strain immediately into a four cup glass measuring cup. Combine the coffee liquid and the sugars in a medium saucepan.

Heat for 5 minutes over low heat, stirring constantly, just until the mixture begins to steam. (Do not boil). Remove the pan from the heat and allow to cool. Stir in the glycerin, vanilla and vodka. Using a funnel, divide the liqueur between two 20 ounce decanters. The coffee liqueur should be ready to drink in 3-4 days and has a shelf life of 2-3 months.

Yield: 5 cups. Recipe from "Homemade In The Kitchen" by Barry Bluestein and Kevin Morrissey, (Viking Studio Books). Glycerin is available at drug stores and gourmet shops.

TAPENADE

1 cup Greek Kalamata Olives, pitted
2 (2-ounce cans) anchovy fillets, with their oil
3 1/2-ounce can tuna, drained
1/2 cup capers, drained
1 teaspoon mustard
1 cup light olive oil
Juice of 1/2 lemon
2 tablespoons brandy (optional)

Combine olives, anchovies, tuna, capers and mustard in a food processor and process until a puree is formed. With the motor running, add the oil slowly, then add the lemon juice and the brandy. Spoon

into a container. Cover and chill for at least 4 hours. Makes 1/2 cup. Chef's Note: When I made this, I omitted the anchovy and tuna and it was magnificent! Recipe from "The Great Food Almanac" by Irena Chalmers, (Collins Publishers).

GUACAMOLE CUBANO

1 large ripe pineapple
4 small avocados
1/4 cup Spanish olive oil 1/4 cup fresh squeezed lime juice
Dash salt
1/4 cup red onion, chopped fine

Slice the pineapple lengthwise in quarters. Peel and remove the core. Cut meat into small cubes and place in a salad bowl. Cut the avocados in half and remove the pits. Carefully remove the skin and cut the avocados into bite sized pieces. Add to pineapple. Whisk together the oil, lime juice and salt and pour it over the fruit. Add the onion and toss gently, being careful not to mash the avocado. Serves 4-6.

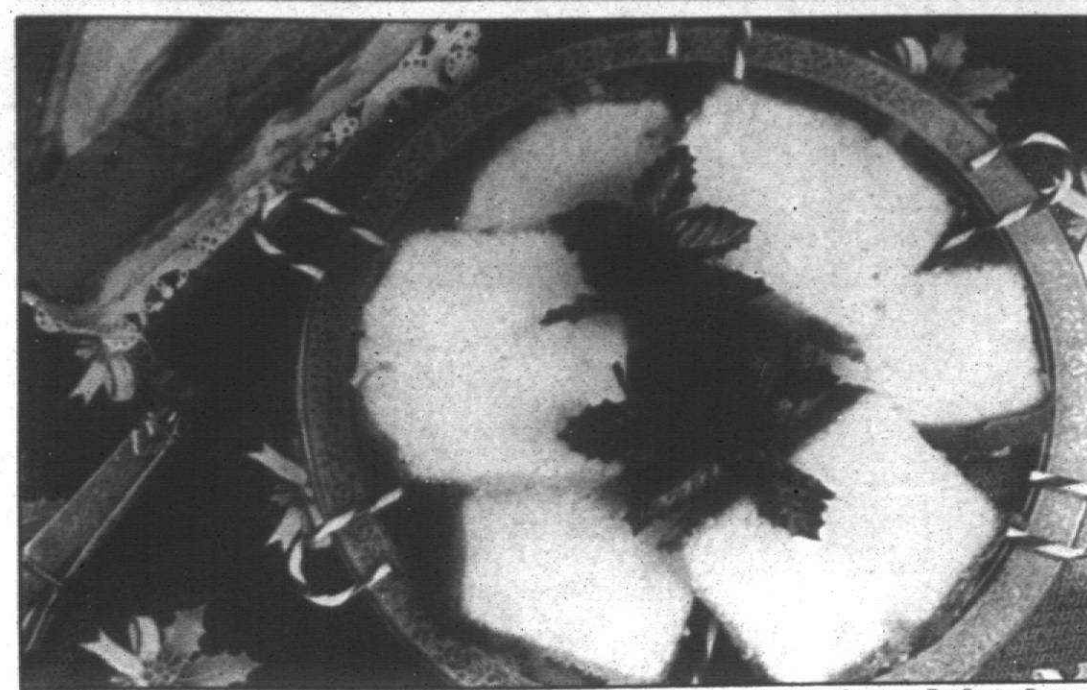

Make this year's holidays healthy

The holiday season is the season of plenty — plenty of good cheer, plenty of celebration, plenty of family visits, plenty of gifts, plenty of food. What would make the season even better would be plenty of good nutrition.

Holiday foods have not traditionally been known for their wholesome quality. They include many treats — cookies, cakes, eggnog and others — that are high in fat and sugar and low in vitamins, minerals and dietary fiber. Rich sauces, gravies and frostings also add lots of fat but few nutrients.

It is possible, however, to make some easy changes to traditional holiday foods that can make them festive, delicious and more healthful.

When you begin your holiday baking, consider using whole grains in cookies, cakes and other sweet treats. This will go a long way toward increasing their dietary fiber content, as well as their vitamins and minerals. Use only three-quarters as much fat (butter, shortening, margarine, etc.) as usual and try adding one or two of your favorite dried fruits for flavor.

Fruits and vegetables are essential sources of sound nutrition, and no holiday meal or buffet is complete without them. Cranberry sweet potatoes, baked apples

with raisins or a fresh fruit ambrosia add colors, textures and tastes that are right in keeping with the season. Vegetable hors d'oeuvres, such as stuffed mushrooms, marinated artichoke hearts and roasted peppers, can be elegant party treats.

Holiday dinners can feature nutritious foods for every course. Start with an apple-walnut-celery-raisin Waldorf salad dressed with plain low-fat yogurt, served on a bed of watercress and garnished with orange slices. Follow it with a vegetable-barley soup or acorn squash soup. With your roast turkey, serve stuffing made with whole grain bread or brown rice and finish the meal with low-fat frozen vanilla yogurt topped

with hot cranberry-cinnamon sauce.

When making your holiday breads, try this delicious Maple Pumpkin Bread recipe. In addition to the goodness of beta-carotene-rich pumpkin, the low-fat yogurt or skim milk and the limited amount of oil keeps fat to a minimum. Whole wheat flour and wheat bran in this recipe add a healthy amount of fiber.

MAPLE-PUMPKIN BREAD

1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 cup wheat bran
2 eggs
1 cup plain low-fat yogurt (or skim milk)

1/2 cup maple syrup
2 tablespoons oil
1 cup mashed cooked pumpkin (or canned)

Sift the flour, baking powder and cinnamon into a large bowl. Stir in the bran (and any bran remaining in the sifter). In a medium bowl, mix the remaining ingredients, then quickly stir them into the dry ingredients just until blended.

Spoon the batter into a lightly oiled 9 by 9-inch loaf pan. Bake at 350 degrees until a knife inserted into the middle comes out clean, about 50-60 minutes.

Each of the 12 slices contains 4 grams of fat and 157 calories. Recipe from the American Institute for Cancer Research.

Day family shares pork chop recipe

BREADED PORK CHOPS

12 boneless pork chops
1 cup flour
1 1/2 teaspoons seasoning salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
2 eggs
1 tablespoon milk
2 cups cracker crumbs
Vegetable oil

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine flour, salt and pepper in a plastic bag large enough to hold one pork chop for shaking. Set aside.

Beat eggs and milk together. Set aside.

Dip dry pork chop into bag with the flour mixture. Shake until chop is completely covered with flour. Take chop out of bag and gently shake off excess flour. Dip chop into egg mixture then into cracker crumbs.

In large skillet, brown pork chops in just enough oil to cover bottom of pan. Remove from pan. Place chops on a rack in a casserole dish or on sliced onions or celery to prevent sticking. Cover with foil. Bake one hour. Serves 6.

New cookbook features quick baked desserts

Who has time to bake desserts? You can, if you plan ahead, said Elinor Klivans, author of "Bake and Freeze Desserts: 130 Do-Ahead Cakes, Pies, Cookies, Brownies, Bars, Ice Creams, Terrines, and Sorbets" (William Morrow & Co., Oct. 20, 1994, \$25).

This newly published cookbook fits the needs of today's busy cooks. Klivans shows you how to make luscious desserts weeks in advance.

As a busy mother, cooking teacher, and restaurant pastry chef, Klivans has transformed her kitchen into the hardest working pastry assistant imaginable. She is the only pastry chef at a restaurant in Maine, where she is well known for her great desserts.

"It dawned on me that if I were ever to have time off, I needed to prepare a variety of desserts, not just a few basic mixtures, freeze them ahead of time, and have them ready and waiting to serve," said Klivans.

The results: A freezer stocked with everything from separate pastry components to be assembled later, to entire, show-stopping desserts. Klivans shares her recipes and tips in her cookbook.

Especially helpful are her tips for labeling desserts, defrosting them, and storing them. There's a chart that tells you how long nuts and desserts — baked and unbaked — can be kept in the freezer.

Here are a few of her tips for freezing desserts:

- Cool desserts before freezing them.
- Keep freezer temperature as close to 0 degrees F as possible.
- Label desserts with date and contents.
- Store desserts inside the freezer, not on door shelves.

This was one of my favorite recipes from the book.

CRANBERRY-PEAR CRUNCH

- 1 cup (packed) light brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 6 ounces (1 1/2 sticks) cold unsalted butter, cut into 12 cubes
- 1 cup sliced or silvered blanched almonds, toasted and cooled
- Vanilla ice cream for serving with the crunch

To prepare the filling: Cut peeled pears into chunks about 1-inch in size. Put the pears into a 2 1/2-quart baking container. Use a 1-inch layer pan with 2-inch high sides or a shallow baking dish that is safe to transfer from freezer to oven.

Mix in 1/4 cup of the sugar, the melted butter and lemon juice. Taste the filling and add up to 1 tablespoon more sugar. Mix in the cranberries and cinnamon and stir the mixture to coat the pears evenly with cinnamon. Wipe the edges of the baking dish clean.

Mix the topping. Put the flour, brown sugar, and cinnamon in a

large bowl and stir together. Add the butter pieces and with an electric mixer, pastry blender or your fingertips mix together just until coarse crumbs form, about 1/4 to 1/2 inch in size. Use a spoon to stir in the cooled, toasted almonds. Sprinkle the crumbs over the pear mixture.

To freeze: Wrap the crunch tightly with plastic wrap then heavy aluminum foil, gently pressing the foil against the crunch. Freeze up to one month.

To bake and serve: Uncover the frozen crunch. Position a rack in the middle of the oven. Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. Bake the frozen crunch 50 to 55 minutes, until the filling just begins to bubble and the crumb topping is a golden color.

Or defrost the crunch in the refrigerator and bake, uncovered, at 325 degrees F. for 40 to 45 minutes. Let the crunch cool about 15 minutes before serving.

Spoon the warm crunch onto individual plates and serve with a scoop of vanilla ice cream.

Whether it's going sledding with friends after a fresh snowfall, baking holiday cookies with kids or sending greeting cards to loved ones, winter is a time for traditions.

According to cookbook author Melanie Bernard, the holiday season is also the perfect time to create new opportunities to celebrate with family and friends.

Here are some creative winter occasions worth celebrating:

- For a delicious, easy-to-make

snack, spread pesto sauce on Italian bread and top with two tomatoes and two slices of sharp cheddar cheese. Broil 2 to 3 minutes until cheese melts and serve warm.

■ End the night relaxing in front of the fire with a hot cup of apple cider or hot chocolate and few of your favorite holiday cookies.

■ Invite loved ones over on New Year's Day to reminisce about the old and welcome in the new. Ask each person to bring a favorite

photo or memory of the previous year. Spend time sharing stories and remembering all the events and occasions that made this past year special.

■ Serve a variety of "new" dishes and ask everyone to bring one of their childhood favorites such as Mom's tuna casserole, meat loaf, peanut butter and jelly sandwiches without the crusts or homemade macaroni and cheese. Share and exchange old recipes and create new favorites.

AP — Just like Cinderella's fairy godmother, you can magically turn pumpkin into something fantastic — a nutritious and scrumptious brownie. Pumpkin moistens and tenderizes these blond brownies, reducing the need for fat. Egg whites also pinch-hit for a whole egg, while coarsely ground nuts add chocolate. When you've got the bars baked and cut, wave your knife and watch. Your brownies will disappear like magic, too.

CHOCOLATE PUMPKIN BROWNIES

- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup canned pumpkin

1 whole egg

2 egg whites

2 tablespoons cooking oil

1 cup all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon unsweetened cocoa powder

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon ground allspice

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1/2 cup miniature semisweet chocolate pieces

Nonstick spray coating

In a large mixing bowl combine brown sugar, pumpkin, egg, egg whites and oil. Beat with an electric mixer on medium speed until

blended. Add flour, baking powder, cocoa powder, cinnamon, allspice, salt and nutmeg. Beat on low speed until smooth. Stir in chocolate pieces.

Spray an 11-by-7-by-1 1/4-inch baking pan with nonstick coating. Pour batter into pan; spread evenly. Bake in a 350-degree F oven for 15 to 20 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool in the pan on a wire rack. Cut into 2-inch squares. Makes 15 squares.

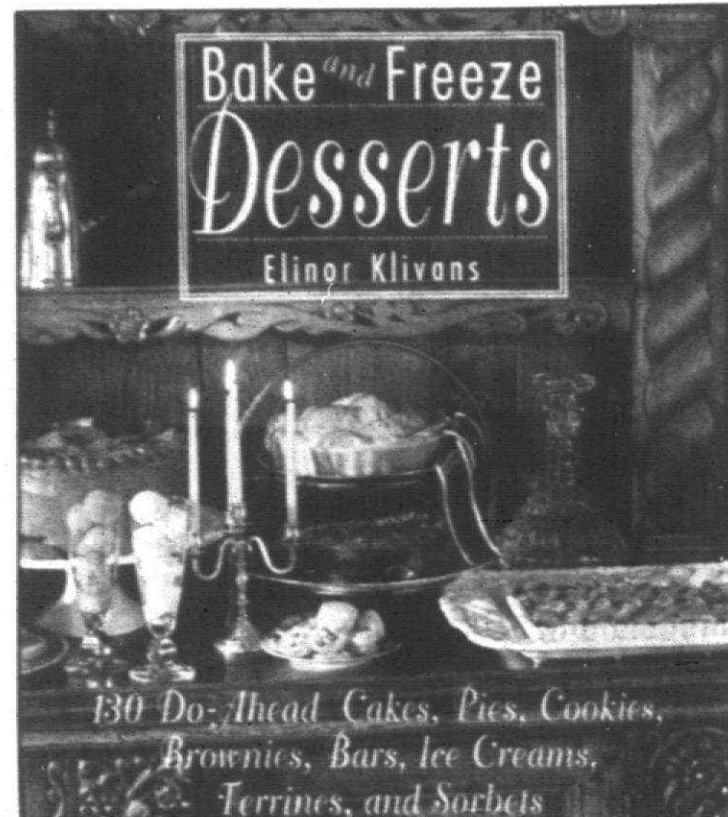

show on cable. Combining these experiences makes me a natural to offer the Michigan Shopping Network.

Wozniak said five minutes of air time on the Michigan Shopping Network costs a retailer \$1,300 or more. She guarantees no competitors will be featured during the 30-minute broadcast. A retailer can offer one or more products during their five-minute segment. A logo box appears on the screen with each product revealing the price, store location, phone number for ordering, and brief merchandise description.

Wozniak chats about the product while it is displayed or presented by professional models. Each presentation is peppered with "Look at this!" and "Call now!" The first show features a Farmington Hills cosmetics company, Kosetter Jewellers in Grosse Pointe, Young Clothes of Grosse Pointe Farms, and Wozniak's own dress shop.

After Tuesday evening's broadcast, the show moves to the weekend where it is repeated 30 times.

"Michigan Shopping Network reaches 23,000 viewers in six of the most affluent cities in the United States with an average disposable income of \$73,000," Wozniak said.

From clothing, jewelry, automobiles and homes to computers, antiques, brokerage firms or medical services, shoppers can order directly from the retailers themselves. Consumers will also help contribute to a stronger area economy by purchasing from area retailers, not sending money to who-knows-where with other home-shopping channels.

Wozniak grew up in Hamtramck. She graduated from St. Florian High School and then went on to Wayne State University in Detroit to earn a degree in psychology. She calls herself an entrepreneur and bubbles with excitement when talking about her latest project.

"Watching the Michigan Shopping Network, consumers become king and retailers are the jewels," she said.

If the show's a hit by January, Wozniak hopes to broadcast the mix to the five Grosse Pointes.

Richard Agnion, president of Suburban Communications Corp., which publishes the Observer & Eccentric Newspapers in metro-Detroit, called the Michigan Shopping Network "an interesting concept." He said local retailers need a good advertising mix to get their message out to shoppers.

U-M economists predict slow growth

University of Michigan economists confessed their forecasts of job and income growth were low in 1994 but continued their caution by predicting slower growth in 1995-6.

The recovery was a good deal stronger than we had forecast, economic researcher George Fulton told U-M's 42nd annual seminar in quantitative economics.

A year ago, Fulton and associates had predicted 1.1 percent growth in wages and salaries; 1994 saw a 2.8 percent growth. They forecast a 2.7 percent growth in personal incomes of Michigan; the actual will be a hefty 8.2 percent.

Fulton, Joan Crary and Professor Paul Hymans predicted personal income growth rates of 6.4 and 5.1 percent for the two years ahead and state revenue growth rate increases of 1.3 and 5 percent in the coming two years.

State treasurer Doug Roberts, in the audience, said afterwards that "I think he's low on his '95 forecast of revenue." A Ph.D. in economics from Michigan State University, Roberts said Fulton should have factored in a federal income tax cut as helping the national and state economies.

"I think there's an 85 percent chance Congress will pass a tax cut, and a 50 percent chance (President Bill) Clinton will sign it," Roberts said in a brief interview in the corridor outside the Rackham Building auditorium in Ann Arbor.

"That will pump \$30 billion to \$40 billion into the economy," Roberts said. But 1996 could be a problem year if congressional tax-cutting bumps into the effects of the Federal Reserve Board's efforts to cool inflation.

As state treasurer, Roberts is responsible for forecasting the economy and revenue for Gov. John Engler. Though disagreeing with Fulton's numbers, he conceded that the state's 1995-6 economic performance won't match this year's.

"If you could look at economic performance charts over 20 years and pick one year in which to run for re-election, 1994 would be the year," said Roberts, whose boss won a second term as governor with 700,000 votes to spare.

The U-M economists were low on their 1994 income forecast because (1) national forecasters had under-guessed motor vehicle sales and (2) manufacturers resorted to record overtime hours, thus pumping up personal income more than job growth, Fulton said.

Within the labor market, Michigan is seeing a "bi-polar" performance — big jumps in executive, managerial and professional jobs and pay at the top and in service jobs at the bottom, Fulton said.

While those numbers are good, Fulton said, "Another measure of success is to broaden the base of the middle class."

Fulton predicted little growth in governmental employment, particularly with the closing for K.I. Sawyer Air Force Base in the Upper Peninsula. "There's not much action at any level of government," he said.

Voter passage of Proposal A has shaken up the state revenue picture, he said. New state tax hikes are dedicated to the school aid fund, leading him to predict roughly 5 percent drops in general fund revenue of \$468 million in each of the two years ahead.

In other papers delivered at the seminar:

■ Real gross domestic product, which grew almost 4 percent this year, will slip to 2.4 and 2.1 percent in the next two years, Hymans said. He saw "hesitation" in industrial orders and consumer sentiment. Clinton's higher tax rates for upper incomes, along with budget restraint, will help slow the economy.

■ Vehicle sales will stay close to the current 15 million level the next two years.

■ Housing starts will slip from this year's 1.4 million to 1.2 million by the end of 1995.

■ "A persistent strength in consumer confidence" was reported by Richard T. Curtin, U-M director of consumer surveys.

A tale of 2 coaches:
A pair of successes

How can we consistently be so inconsistent? In judging coaches, I mean. Our rather questionable logic is based upon success — but only to a certain point. Once a team surpasses that rather arbitrary boundary, however, the significance of coaching suddenly diminishes.

It becomes talent that got them there. There's no sense to any of this, but nonetheless the formula is constant. A coach who transforms a perennial loser into a .500 team is lauded; a coach who always has his/her team challenging for the championship is taken for granted.

The justification for such ludicrous hypocrisy usually goes something like "anyone can win with that kind of talent."

It's as if, by serving as the architect in the construction of a successful program, a coach has ruined his ability to coach.

In the just completed fall semester, Plymouth Canton was blessed with superior coaching in two sports in particular: boys soccer and girls basketball.

Don Smith guided the Chiefs' soccer team to its first-ever Class A state title in boys soccer. Bob Blohm helped the Canton girls basketball team weave its way into Class A's Final Four.

The two are unlike in most ways, but they do share one trait: Their teams win.

Smith deserves better

Smith is certainly in the more unusual position. Although his teams are constantly at or near the top of the Western Lakes Activities Association standings, opposing coaches never give him any credit.

There are even those who heard some of the back-patting for Canton's triumphs themselves, noting how they coached one or two of the Chiefs during the summer.

Smith preaches an aggressive style. His strategies seem basic, to be sure: sprint down the wings and send players into the box to field a cross.

On defense, the Chiefs pressure the ball with one defender draped all over the opposition's best scorer.

That's simplified, of course. What upsets many opposing coaches is Smith's encouraging a no-holds-barred defensive strategy.

Their fury is concealed; instead they insist it's the players, not Smith's coaching.

I say this: There are plenty of good soccer teams in Oberverland because there are so many good coaches. Smith is one of them.

He may not be the best at formulating a plan of attack, but he always found a way to get his team prepared. Throughout this season's state tournament run, the Chiefs never came up flat.

Canton deserved what it got — a state championship. And Smith, who has a state title in both boys and girls soccer to his credit, deserves the recognition.

A communicator

Bob Blohm's reputation is all-together different than Smith's. Since he started coaching girls basketball at Plymouth Salem in 1978, Blohm has been lauded.

The praise is well-deserved.

Us older folk on the sports staff at the Observer still recognize a Livonia Bentley team from 1980 as one of our area's best-ever. Kim Archer was a sophomore on that squad; she went on to star at Michigan State.

And yet Blohm's Salem team, which didn't have a starter over 5-foot-8, beat Bentley in the state tournament and eventually reached the Final Four.

What he did with the Canton team this season was just as astounding. Four starters from last year's team were gone, and yet Blohm pushed and prodded the Chiefs to the state semifinals.

His best attribute is his ability to communicate with his players. Other coaches know what is coming from a Blohm-coached team: A motion offense, featuring pass after pass until a good shot is found, and person-to-person defense.

Handling it is another question.

The Chiefs went into the state semifinals as the long shot. They could not possibly match the athletic ability or size of any of the other three teams.

However, that isn't what prevented them from reaching the final. Had Blohm been given more than two days to prepare, the Chiefs might have pulled off an upset.

No doubt the other teams had superior talent. But after watching all four squads play, I know none was better coached.

Rocks wreck Jays for 1st win

Perhaps it should never have been so close at the end, but the end result was still all right with Plymouth Salem's basketball team.

The Rocks recorded their first victory of the season Friday, holding off Southfield 74-67 at Salem.

The win leveled Salem's record at 1-1; Southfield is also 1-1.

"It feels good to get that first win," said Rocks' coach Bob Brodie. "We led wire-to-wire. They fouled us a lot in the fourth quarter and tried to play catch-up."

Which resulted in 24 Salem free throws in the final quarter. But the Rocks could only convert 13 of them, which allowed Southfield to close the gap. Salem finished 24-of-42 (57 percent) from the line; the Blue Jays were 14-of-17 (82 percent).

Dan McKian's 18 points paced the Rocks. James McDonald added 15

and Andre's Lopez had 12.

Southfield got 16 points from Mike Hills, 15 from Maurice Watkins and 10 from Ken Williams.

Salem led 9-6 after one quarter and 29-23 at the half.

■ **Monroe 70, Canton 69 (OT):** The Chiefs lost their second-straight game in the final seconds, this time in overtime.

"We should be winning these games," said first-year coach Dan Young. "We played our butts off, we just didn't get it done in the end."

Monroe (2-0) had to rally in the fourth quarter after Canton, behind Mark Bray's seven points, outscored the Trojans 21-8 in the third quarter. Still, the Chiefs had a chance to win

in regulation, but Ted Docks — 8-of-9 from the line for the game — missed his only free throw in the final seconds.

Docks, who finished with 24 points, four steals and four assists, pulled Canton to within a point by making three-straight from the line with :12 left in OT. But the Chiefs could not foul Monroe or regain possession.

Ron Hunter added 16 points, eight rebounds and four assists for Canton, with Bray and Brandon Hartke scoring eight apiece. Monroe got 30 points from Don Marcero; Spencer Roecker netted 13 more.

■ **Redford CC 85, Gallagher 65:** Senior Mike Ridley poured in a game-high 28 points and junior Justin Hoener added 21 as Redford Catholic Central (2-0) earned the victory over visiting Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher (1-

1). CC put it away by outscoring the Lancers 26-16 in the final period.

Had Plymouth Canton managed to put a few more wrestlers with varsity experience on the mat, it would have scored a few more points.

The season-opener just didn't turn out that way for either team, however. Both were beaten by visiting Monroe Thursday, Salem losing by a 38-30 margin and Canton getting trounced 68-18 in a pair of meets at Canton.

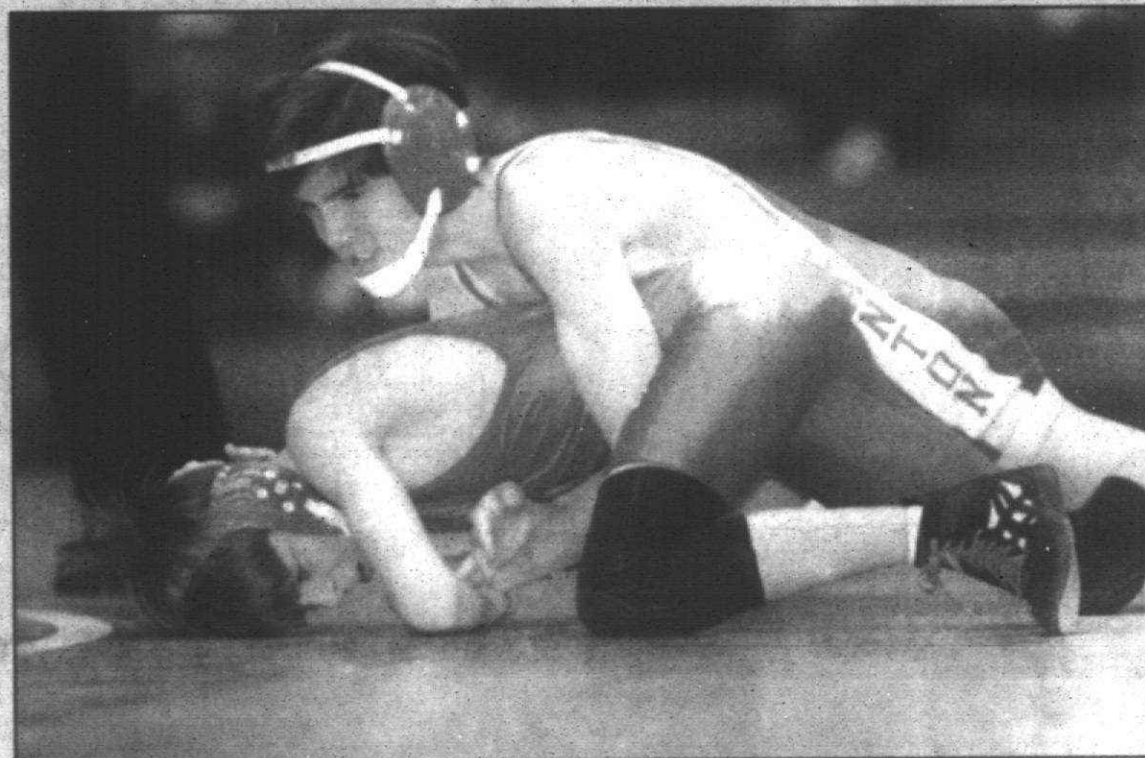
For Salem coach Ron Krueger, the loss was difficult to accept — mainly because it could easily have been otherwise.

"We had a lot of things happen against us," Krueger said. "But it was a learning experience."

The match that turned the tide toward Monroe, the Salem coach felt, was at 126 pounds. Scott Hughes, one of the Rocks' better wrestlers, and the Trojans' Aaron Bezeau battled through a wild three periods before Bezeau emerged with a 13-12 victory.

"That was the one that won the meet for them," Krueger said.

The Rocks had other chances, however. They started strongly, winning two of the first three matches. Monroe's Eric Nowtze pinned Sa-

The final match left Krueger dumbfounded. "He had (Monroe's Sperr) on his back," Krueger said. Then, for reasons he did not understand, the official stopped the match, claiming he thought the Trojan wrestler was injured. Had the result been reversed, with Salem winning on a pin, the Rocks would have won the meet.

"I told the kids, you leave things to chance and that's the kind of

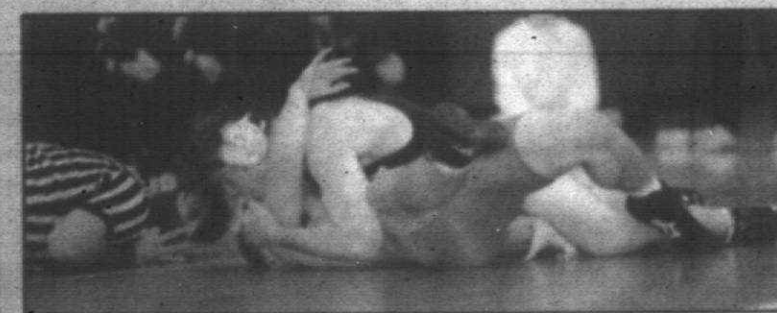
thing that'll happen," said Krueger.

It was never close as Madonna fell to 1-6.

seven more from Spencer Roecker.

Salem kept battling, but never caught up. The problem was evident — the Trojans had too much of everything.

"They're a good basketball team," summed up Rocks coach Bob Brodie. "They ran the floor well, they posted up well, they passed well, they shot the ball well... and they've got everyone back (from last season). They're seasoned. There's no substitute for experience."

"I don't fault (the Rocks) for effort. They could have easily given up and they didn't. But I don't know what (Monroe's) weak point was."

If the Trojans had one, it never materialized. They connected on 31-of-59 of their floor shots (52.5 percent), including six three-pointers — coming from four different players, two of them off the

bench. They had size (a starting lineup measuring 6-foot-6, 6-5, 6-3, 6-1 and 5-10), quickness and depth.

It was that depth that gave Monroe the boost it needed. Salem pulled to within 25-24 with 5:20 left in the first half when the Trojan bench began to assert itself. Greg Jones was instrumental in Monroe's repelling the Rocks' rally, coming off the bench to knock down two triples in a 12-4 run that pushed that one-point lead to 37-28.

The spread remained nine at the half (41-32), but Monroe pushed it to 57-41 by the midpoint of the third quarter before Salem could mount another rally. The Rocks scored six-straight to get it back to 11, then went the final 2:55 of the third quarter without scoring.

The beginning of the final period was the same for Salem — nearly half the quarter with just one basket, allowing the Trojans to go up 66-50. The deficit remained in double-digits the rest of the way.

A big difference in this Monroe team compared to last season's 16-7 squad, according to coach Ernie Sellers Jr.: "I like our depth. We had Greg Jones and Larry Middleton come off the bench and hit some big shots for us."

"It's so important to be able to do that. You have to be able to rest your starters."

Monroe got 24 points from Marcero, 17 from Roecker, 10 from Lof-ton Kelley, nine from Middleton and eight from Jones. Salem was led by Doug Herriman's 18 points. Dan McKian had 12, Justin Marcis 10 and Nate Ledbetter eight.

As Sellers said afterwards: "It's only one game." Brodie would agree; his team did not play poorly (the Rocks were 25-of-54 from the floor, 46.3 percent), but it can play better.

"Now it's a matter of how we bounce back," he said. With a schedule that has home dates with Southfield, Ypsilanti and Ann Arbor Huron up next, the Rocks better bounce back fast.

Kirk Douglas stars in bittersweet tale of love

A father and son on a quixotic road trip that affirms their bond of love — that's how a philosopher might sum up *Take Me Home Again*, a TV movie airing Sunday, Dec. 18, on NBC.

Kirk Douglas plays the father, Ed Reece, and Craig T. Nelson is his prodigal son, Larry, but that wasn't the original casting plan.

"Several years ago," says Douglas, "my son Michael sent me the book, *The Lies Boys Tell*, by Lamar Herrin. We had been looking for several years to do something together, and he said, 'What about this?'"

"And I said, 'No, Michael, it's too heavy. We'll find something else.' And then about nine months ago they sent me the script, and I thought it had a lot more humor in it, and I liked it. I said, 'Michael, let's do it.'"

"Well, he was then about to start a movie with Demi Moore (*Disclosure*), and he wasn't gonna give her up for me, so I made it with Craig T. Nelson, who I think is a wonderful actor. I enjoyed working with him, and I enjoyed making the movie. We'll see what happens."

In the story, cagey, willful Ed Reece is dying of cancer, but he is

really sick of being treated like a memory rather than the man he still is. His wife, Sylvia (Bonnie Bartlett), is consumed by fear, and his straight-arrow son Russ (Richard Gilliland) lacks imagination. His divorced daughter, Nell (Lee Garlington), and Larry's ex-wife, Connie (Bess Armstrong), are understanding, but it is Larry he longs to see.

Secretly Ed sends for Larry, who is received by the rest of the family with a mixture of surprise and hostility. Soon Larry discovers his father has more plans for him: He is to drive the dying man to the house where he was born, so he can die in the bed where he first slept in his mother's arms.

"Very often," says Douglas, "it's the bad apple that's the favorite. Here was the son that had gone away. That was the son that he always wanted. And I think obviously if you compare him to the other brother, he was the son that was more like the father. I think by the end you'd like to see that (Larry and Ed) really loved each other."

Douglas has done a lot of thinking about fathers and sons. The very title of his autobiography, *The Ragman's Son*, is proof of how

important the relationship is to him.

During the weeks of filming on the road, Douglas and Nelson spent many hours together, discussing their feelings about Ed and Larry.

"Craig kept telling me that I reminded him of his father. Now I don't know whether that's good or bad," he says with a chuckle, "but we had a very warm relationship."

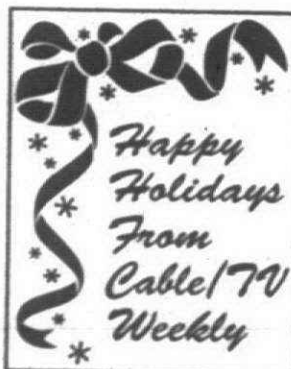
"He had read my autobiography, which deals with my whole relationship with my father, and he was quite intrigued by the relationship between fathers and sons. He had quite a dramatic relationship with his father. So, in a way, out of that came (the direction for) playing our roles."

Out on the road, Larry and Ed are forced to work together as a team, whether talking a state trooper out of a ticket or a country-club snob into a round of golf. Ed knows that only Larry has the audacity to help him achieve his dream, and Larry knows the rest of the family will never understand anyway.

"Ed knew that Larry would be the only one who would want to do this crazy thing of taking him back to the place where he was born, in the bed where he was born," Douglas says. "They are fighting all the time, but there is a love (between them). Every obstacle they face is like a test they pass."

"Both of the characters, to me, have a streak of craziness, and I think that's necessary in life."

"It's like Browning's poem: 'Grow old along with me! The best is yet to be.' I think one must always have that feeling, always have a goal just a little bit beyond your reach."

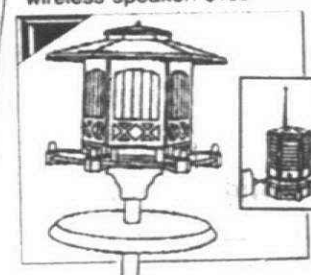

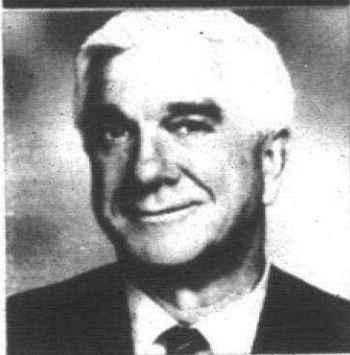

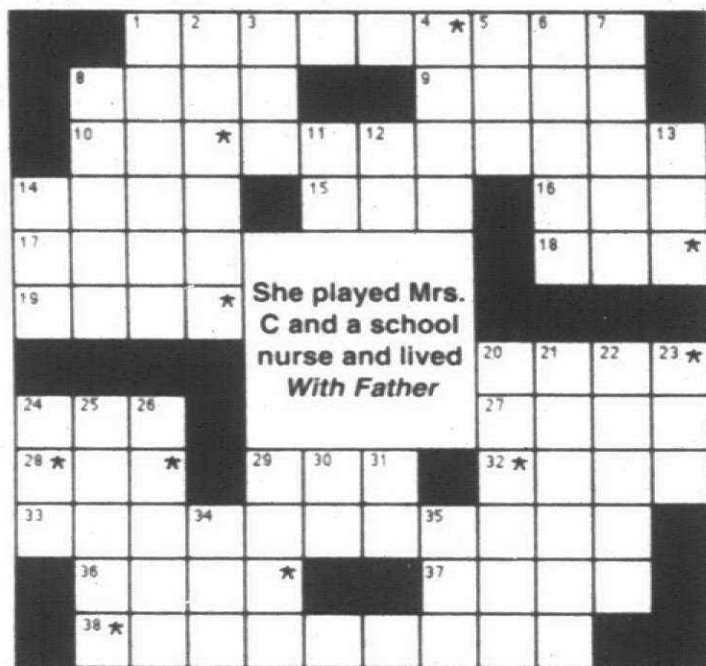

PBS hopes to run up numbers
with Pfeiffer-featuring science series

Michelle Pfeiffer is to be the host of a six-part series on women in the sciences, airing over three weeks next spring on PBS. *Discovering Women* will profile a high-energy physicist, a biochemist, a geophysicist, an archaeologist, a neuroscientist and a molecular biologist. The series is part of a larger initiative by Boston's WGBH-TV, titled *S.O.S.: Seek Out Science*. Aimed at middle- and high-school students, the idea is to provide role models for women and minorities, who are historically underrepresented among the ranks of working scientists.

A talk show made in heaven? George Hamilton and his ex-wife, Alana, will head up *The George & Alana Show*, debuting in syndication next fall. Trade-journal ads hyping the show insist, "The thing that really makes a show like this work is the chemistry between the two people." Isn't that what they said about *Jim and Tammy Faye Bakker*?

Inside Edition co-anchor Deborah Norville is expecting a baby this Christmas, and one waggish reporter has already asked her whether the gossip newsmagazine show will try to get exclusive coverage of the delivery. Quoth Norville, "If I don't tell them where I'm having it, they won't be able to put it on TV, will they?" That may depend on the strength of their investigative reporting.
