Remedy sought for PR mishmash

In an attempt to clear up a longstanding problem with faulty communications, township officials have proposed creating a new division that would coordinate everything from newsletter writing to handouts for the Board of Trustees.

Canton Township government officials are hoping that the creation of a new "centralized communications division" will eliminate the "sometimes fragmented communications and conflicting messages" that emanate from township hall.

"It is clear from reviewing the current communications efforts within the organization that there is not enough effort made to unify the efforts of various departments," said a proposal presented to the Board of Trustees by Supervisor Tom Yack. "The result is sometimes fragmented communications and conflicting mes-

sages from different departments." Until October, the township's public relations were handled by Ken Voyles, who is a political appointee of Yack; Police Officer Lew Stevens of the Public Safety Department; and Casey Hans, who resigned last month after 2½ years as municipal services information coordinator.

With so many people involved with gathering and disseminating information, confusion sometimes results.

For example, Voyles recently compiled information on cities that pick up leaves at curbside for residents. He didn't know, however, that such a study was done four years ago by the

Municipal Services Department. Hans was hired to handle communication with residents and businesses relative to ongoing development in the township, but she was ultimately pulled in all directions and assigned duties that had little to do with communications.

"When they hired me, I don't know if they totally knew what direction they wanted that position to go in," Hans said.

"Because Casey was so talented, she probably got asked to do some things that may have been a stretch

Canton teen-ager remembered for giving

It is ironic that 17-year-old Judy Rosin of Canton was instrumental in the Students Against Driving Drunk chapter at Belleville High School.

Judy, a high school senior, was disconnected from life support systems at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ypsilanti early Saturday, Nov. 18, less than two days after she was injured in a two-car accident on Cherry Hill Road. It is believed the Redford driver who struck her car had been drinking.

"It will be a couple of weeks or better before we seek a warrant," said Canton Police Detective Sgt. Bill Keppen, adding that police will wait for the results of chemical tests taken from the Redford driver the night of the accident.

On Monday, a counselor sat in every class that Judy would have attended and educators were monitoring her 20 closest friends. Many classmates

were unaware of Judy's death, which was announced by teachers at first-hour classes, said Paul Druker, Judy's high school counselor.

Judy, who was recently accepted to Eastern Michigan University, was on her way with her 9-year-old sister, Krystal Morgan, to pick up her brother, Andy, at a nearby Meijer where both worked. Andy is also a senior at Belleville High School.

In addition to her work with the SADD chapter, Judy was a member of the French Club and Wolverine Dart Association. In fact, Judy traveled to France last summer. "Personally, it's been hard for me," Druker said. "I'm a co-sponsor of the French Club."

Druker described Judy as a comforting friend for others, but always in a quiet way. "She was the most popular behind the scenes," said the counselor who met with Judy's family Sunday night. "She was the kind of young lady who saw the big picture. This is what everything is all about."

Judy also was on the Belleville High School soccer team and volunteered at the Belleville Moose Lodge.

Collections are being taken for Judy's family, which does not have medical insurance. The faculty at Belleville High School is also taking up a collection. Anyone who would like to help the family with funeral and associated costs may make donations through the Wayne-Westland Federal Credit Union to account number, Judy Rosin, 61278-8.

Canton police are continuing the investigation into the accident, in which Judy's sister, Krystal, received minor injuries, Keppen said.

The Redford driver, whose name is being withheld pending arrest and arraignment, struck Judy's Chevette on Cherry Hill, near Denton, about 11 p.m. The driver was transported to St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, treated and released. When police arrived at the scene of the accident, officers reported that they could smell a strong odor of intoxicants, according to po-



lice reports. The Redford driver, initially denied he had been drinking prior to the accident. He later said he had had five beers about one hour before the acci-

Chief financial officer garners recognition

Canton Township Chief Financial Officer John Spencer has been inducted into Madonna University's Epsilon Gamma chapter of Delta Mu Delta, the national honor society in business.

"I'm honored to be considered for membership," Spencer said. "It shows that if you work hard you get some rewards."

Spencer is working on a master's degree in business administration at Madonna and has a grade point average of 3.8. He has six credits to go and expects to finish in spring 1997.

To be eligible for admission in Delta Mu Delta, a business student must have more than a B average, be in the top 20 percent of his class in grade point average, and be nominated by a faculty member.

Out of about 300 eligible students at Madonna this year, 90 were nominated for Delta Mu Delta and 60 accepted.

The honor society was formed in

1913 at New York University.

In a letter to Spencer, Madonna assistant professor Gary Fischer said Delta Mu Delta membership "denotes a scholar among scholars."

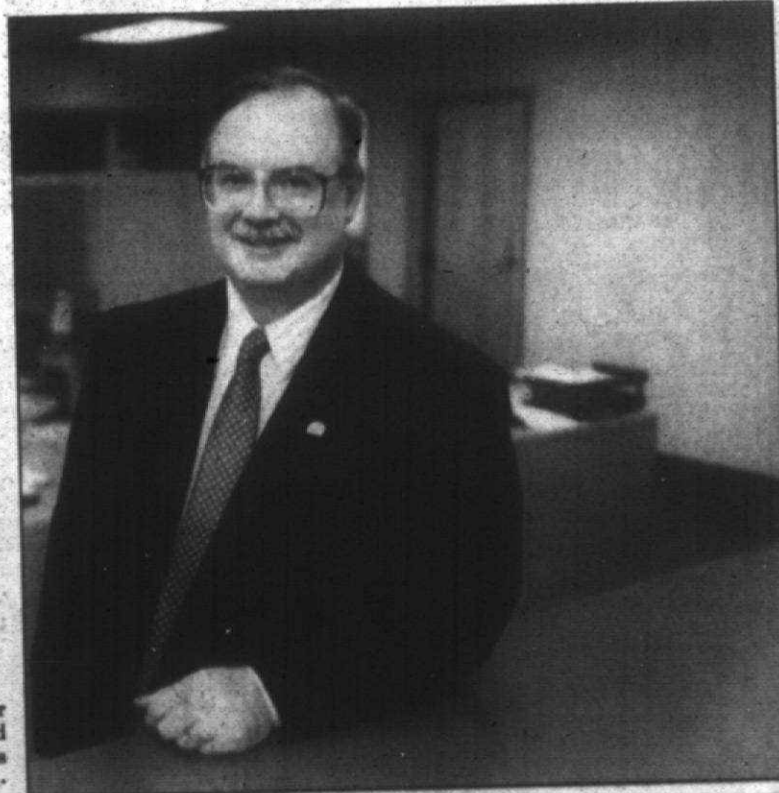
"John is a noteworthy student," said Fischer in a phone interview. "His experience and intensity really come through. He really likes to learn and he works very hard."

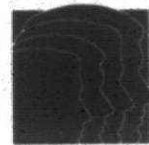

Seminar offers hope to the abused

Canton resident Debra Siddall's abusive ex-husband continues to stalk and harass her. Although he's violating probation, no one would help her. After attending a domestic violence seminar in Livonia last week, she feels hopeful.

As Debra Siddall speaks of the last 13 years of her life, the word "prisoner" comes to mind.

The years of abuse the Canton resident has suffered at the hands of her now ex-husband have made her terrified of leaving her home. She suffers from migraines, anxiety attacks and post-traumatic stress syndrome.

Siddall has a fear of being out in public and feels the need to look over her shoulder all the time. The only way she knows how to survive is by creating what she calls "a split personality."

"The real me is a real nice person. I'm outgoing; I'm caring; I'm giving," she said. "I do whatever I can. I let people walk all over me. When I feel threatened, I turn into a bitch. I take on this attitude like, 'Don't mess with me.' I get aggravated, frustrated, tense. I'm just not to be reckoned with."

And all her ex-husband gets is a slap on the hand.

That's the even after he violated a court order three times to not make contact with her. The order was part of the condition of his probation af-

ter he was released from jail in April on felony charges of aggravated assault.

"They will do nothing," she said. "All they said they could do was bring him in and re-explain the law to him. The law is not working for some of us. You get to a point where you want to give up."

Making strides

To quell her fears and those of others in her situation, the Wayne County Coordinating Council to Prevent Domestic Violence gathered in Livonia Nov. 16 to tell more than 400 abuse survivors, women's advocates, prosecutors, judges, coun-

selors and the public the strides the group has made — and will make — in combatting domestic violence.

"Basically, we want to let people know that we are actually dealing with this problem," said Judge Richard Halloran of 36th District

This is the handwriting of a woman who appears to be having difficulty adjusting to a major change in life.

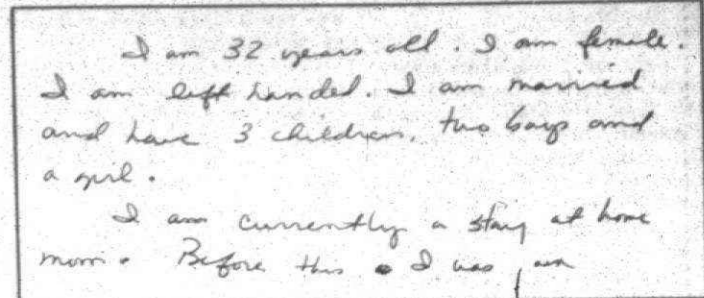
Within herself she appears to be having ambivalent feelings about this change in lifestyle.

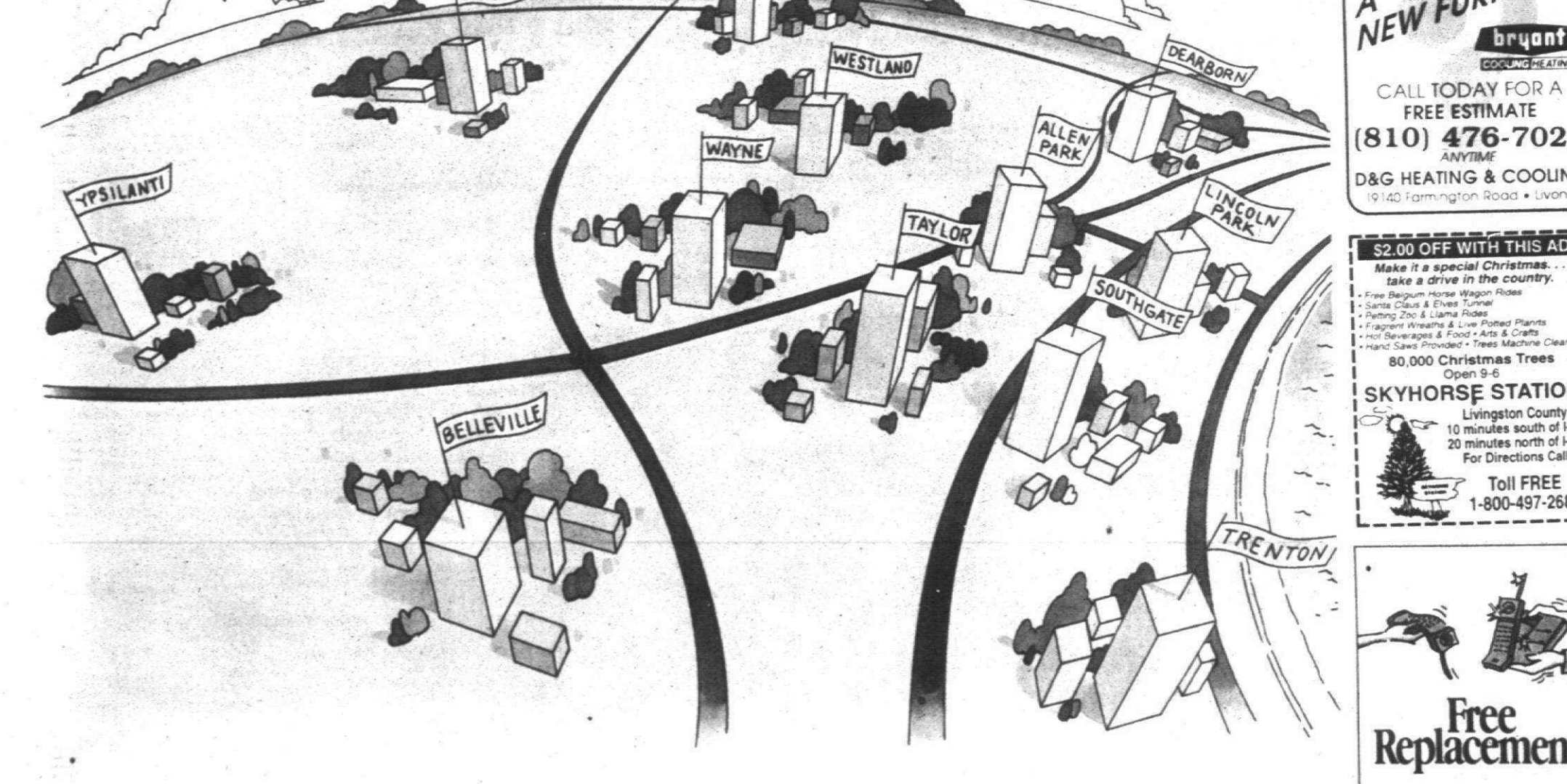

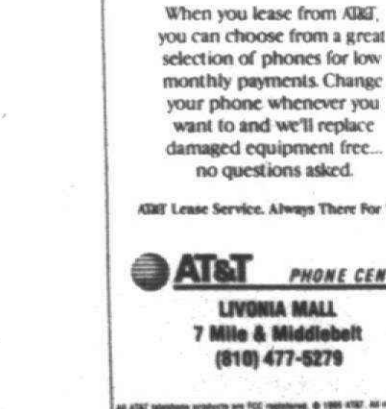

Book geared for the partners of breast cancer patients

When Al Barrineau's wife, Harriett, was diagnosed with breast cancer, his world was "shaken to the core," he admits.

Suddenly, like many support partners of breast cancer patients, Barrineau sadly recalled, "I didn't know what to do to help her. I didn't know what she needed most from me."

In the ongoing crises of diagnosis, surgery and treatment for breast cancer, most attention is obviously directed toward the patient. After years of working with breast cancer patients and their families, breast health specialist and certified oncology nurse Judy C. Kneece decided it was time to do something for patients and support partners alike.

For support partners, Kneece wrote "Helping Your Mate Face Breast Cancer."

Spouses and other support people often will hover somewhere in the background, trying to maintain a stoic exterior and stifling their own emotions in order to "be strong" for the patient. Many support partners recall feeling a need to take action and "make things better" but are at a loss as to exactly what they should say or do.

In approximately 150 pages with illustrations, "Helping Your Mate Face Breast Cancer" offers a wide range of "tips for becoming an effective support partner," from coping with their own emotional pain and telling the children, to handling insurance and financial matters.

It provides an overview of the patient's surgery and treatment options as well as her emotional ups and downs at various stages of the process toward recovery. It also looks at the issues of changes in the sexual relationship and provides a glossary of important terms and a list of resources.

Each chapter is laced with Barrineau's recollections of the process he, his wife and their four children have gone through since her diagnosis and surgery several

years ago. Also included are inspirational quotes and tips from varied sources.

"As I look back," Barrineau comments at the book's end, "I

can honestly say that, as bad as the breast cancer experience was for both of us, it has resulted in tremendous growth as individuals and as a couple."

Kneece's book is written with the hope and intent that many more women facing breast cancer and their support partners — whether they be spouses, other family members or simply "friends in need" — might emerge from the experience with similar recollections.

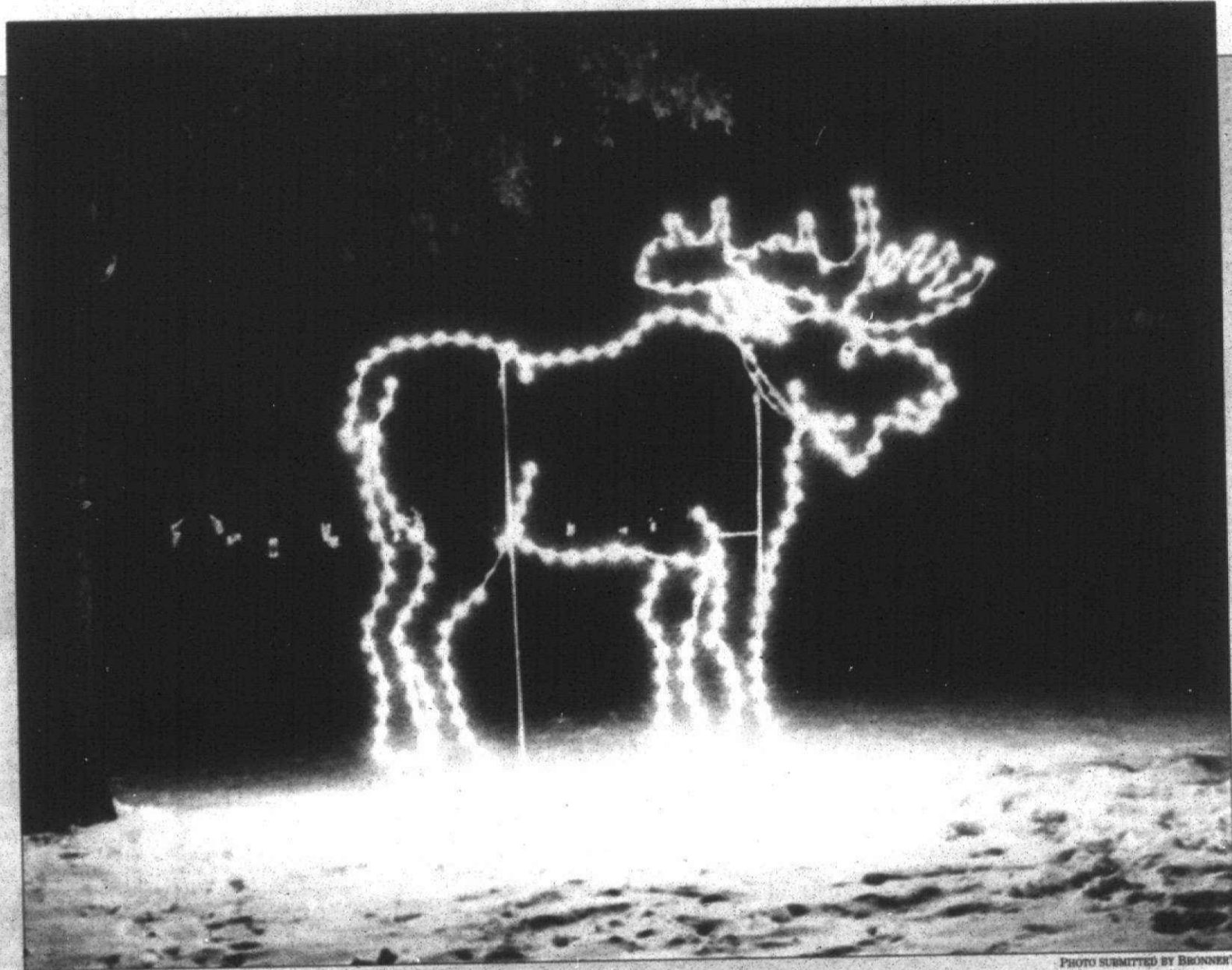

LIGHT SHOWS keep holidays aglow

Metro Detroit is turned on to holiday light displays. Holiday light shows make for an inexpensive family evening out and a way to brighten the season.

The 3-year-old LightFest is Wayne County's offering. It features 35 displays over a four-mile stretch of Hines Drive, between Merriman and the Warrendale picnic area in Dearborn Heights.

Lightfest, produced by the county parks division, includes about 500,000 lights. New this year are a Nativity scene, a Menorah scene and a Kwanzaa scene.

LightFest continues through Jan. 1 (closed on Christmas) 7-10 p.m. The cost is \$5 per car, (including vans and recreational vehicles), \$20 for limousines and small buses and \$50 for full-size buses.

Traffic enters Hines Drive at Merriman in Westland, proceeds east, one way, and exits at Warren, just east of Telegraph. Refreshments, a gift shop and photos with Santa will be available at the Warrendale picnic area.

Here's a look at three other area holiday light shows:

- The Detroit Zoo's Wild Lights boasts more than 40 displays of over 250,000 lights along a half-mile walking path. The trail features an animated whale, a pair of elephants, a train full of animals, a stegosaurus and more. Trees and shrubs along the path are also decorated with lights.

Wild Lights continues from 5:30-8 p.m. through Saturday, Dec. 30, at the zoo. It is closed on

Thanksgiving Day, all day Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

Admission is \$3 for adults and \$1.50 for children. Parking is free. Admission for Detroit Zoological Society members is \$2 for adults and \$1 for children. Refreshments available.

The zoo is at Woodward and 10 Mile, near I-696, in Royal Oak.

- The display at Domino's Farms features more than 800,000 lights, a laser show and indoor exhibits of decorated Christmas trees and Nativity scenes.

friends," she said.

Fike is part of "The Nutcracker" corps. Among other roles, she's a dancer in the "Waltz of the Flowers." Like many of the dancers in the company, Fike has endured sore muscles and pinched toes. But it's all worth it once the curtain goes up on opening night.

"It's just a big rush. You're there to perform. It feels like you're in front of a million people," she said.

Katie Robiadek, 14, of Canton, who also dances in the "Waltz of the Flowers," plans to transcend any opening night jitters. "I'm going to think about the music. Dance is an arch between motionless and complete collapse," she said.

Justin Lafferty, 13, of Westland and Dean Sheremet, 15, of Dearborn, both of whom claim "lifting girls is easy," have their own concerns about opening night.

"I'll think about everybody watching me and about making sure I don't screw

up," said Lafferty, who plays a sergeant in the battle scene.

Artistic Director Dawn Greene founded the company with her husband, Beck, in 1991. She has been part of many opening nights, both as a dancer and dance teacher. A former member of the Severo Ballet Company, she has directed three ballet companies and has taught for 23 years.

"I enjoy doing 'The Nutcracker' every year because it's different every year, different children. And we change the choreography a bit," she said.

The innovative Greene has started a special "Nutcracker" tradition. She uses parents of dancers in the opening party scene. "The ones that did it last year loved it," she said.

At 28, Michael Finegan of Plymouth is one of the company's oldest members. Dancing was his avocation until his marriage last year made him seek a career with a more certain income. He's now a

computer sales representative. "Dancing is not my career any more. It's my passion," he said.

Both Finnegan and Greene are delighted "The Nutcracker" will be performed with the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra. "The orchestra has been great," said Finnegan. "It really makes the dancers perform better to dance to live music."

Plymouth-Canton Ballet Company member Tim Smola of Plymouth is currently in Spain with Disney's production of "Pocahontas." He will return home to play the Cavalier. Deborah Buttner, the guest dancer from the Ballet Classique of Fort Lauderdale, will play the Sugar Plum Fairy.

Dancing in the "Nutcracker" is about magic. It's the feeling Pamela Lawrie, who plays the Snow Queen, gets when she is lifted above her partner's shoulders. "I feel like I'm flying," she said.

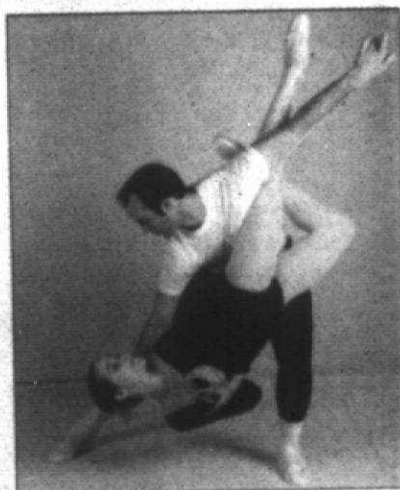


Catch the lobster at Steamers

Lobster lovers can find this favorite seafood delicacy in abundance at the new Steamers Seafood Grill in Troy (as well as the Farmington Hills restaurant). "I have lobsters flown in fresh out of Maine and pick them up daily," said John R. Kaufman, vice-president of operations. A one pound Maine lobster is \$14.95.

Both locations have identical menus, which vary for lunch and dinner, but are predominantly seafood. Saffron Lobster Creme, a rich lobster broth containing your choice of lobster, shrimp, chicken, scallops, or seafood (such as a combination of shrimp, scallops and mussels) is a specialty. The lunchtime portion with lobster is \$9.95, and it's \$15.95 at dinner.

One recent afternoon, over lunch, Sonya Smith of Troy and Paul Posch of White Lake both had the lobster special. "It was fine," said Posch. Smith said she

too liked the lobster, which was accompanied by a fresh vegetable rice. "The rice was definitely good," she said.

The Steamers informal decor also was satisfying to her. "I like the stories about the different kinds of seafood," she said, referring to the framed prints on the walls that each showed a different kind of fish, with a description of it.

"I liked the little dishcloths," she went on. "It's a nice touch. And the tablecloths you can write on if you're having a business lunch." Silverware comes to the table wrapped in a pink-checked terry-towel dishcloth. Tables are covered with cloths and topped with white butcher paper, which is replaced from a long roll every time the table is set.

The dinner menu lists soups and chowders; starters and shellfish; stews including Provencales, Creole and Cioppino, as well as the Saffron Lobster Creme; and specialties. The latter includes seafood entrees

(some with pasta), plus grilled herb chicken, barbecued ribs, and porterhouse and eye steaks.

Stews and specialties are served with the house salad (greens, tomatoes, cucumber and mandarin oranges in a honey-basil vinaigrette dressing), served family style, and a loaf of homemade bread brought to the table in its paper bag wrapper, along with herb butter.

Also on the menu at lunch are sandwiches and salads. Maryann McGraw and Toni Kubica, both of Rochester Hills, ordered these at lunch recently. McGraw called her pita primavera "good" and Kubica sampled the chicken Caesar salad ("It's very good."). Pita Pockets also may be ordered with chicken or shrimp. Other sandwiches containing seafood include an open whitefish sandwich and a crabcake burger with cheddar cheese and Remoulade sauce.

Tuna, salmon, halibut and sole are often among the restaurant's daily seafood specials. "It depends on what's fresh daily.

What's flown in fresh that morning," restaurateur Kaufman pointed out. "I'm serving the same sole that Anthony Pier, Boston is selling that night."

Usually there are three or four daily specials. The lobster and rib eye were specials that day, along with a lightly breaded whitefish served with potato

pancakes and lightly sauteed fresh spinach.

John Acedilo is executive chef at the Troy restaurant, which opened in mid-September. Antonio Vaughn is executive chef at the Farmington Hills location, which opened three years ago at 12 Mile and Orchard Lake roads.

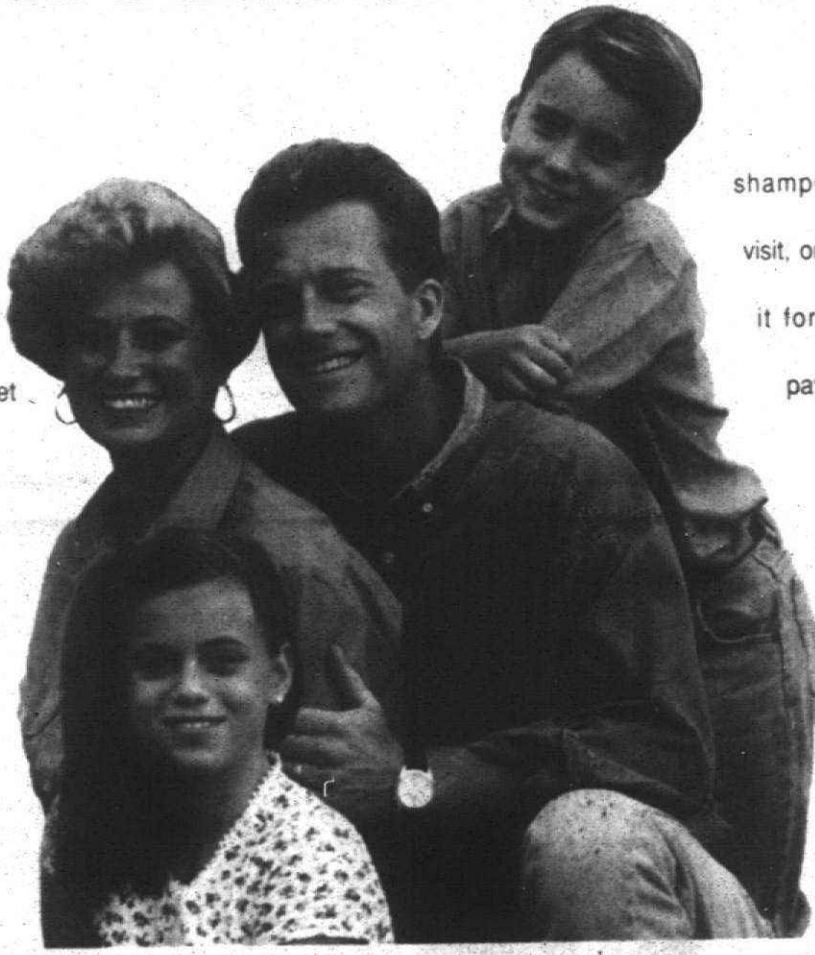

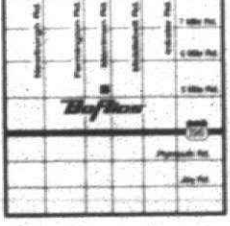

Rocks regional is rescheduled

Finally, it's out of the courts and onto the courts.

A slightly humorous play on words perhaps, but there were four girls' basketball teams — at least — that find no humor in it. But now, however, the families of three players cannot hold the rest of the state tournament participants hostage.

Plymouth Salem was one of those teams. The Rocks won their district last Friday with a dramatic, 51-48 triumph over Northville. However, any momentum salvaged from that win faded when it was learned Monday's regional opener would be postponed.

The reason: Three players from

Oak Park — Sharionde Jackson, Danielle Jones and Nekeyua Richardson — were ruled ineligible by the Michigan High School Athletic Association when questions regarding their residency were raised, and validated.

The players' parents filed suit against the MHSAA in Oakland County Circuit Court, and an injunction was issued just prior to Friday's district final. That forced a cancellation of the district final between Oak Park and Detroit Pershing, until the issue was resolved.

Salem was to play the Oak Park-Pershing winner Monday. The hearing wasn't until Tuesday.

That's when Oakland Circuit Judge Fred Mester found in favor of

the MHSAA, ruling that a private association with voluntary membership had self-jurisdiction. The injunction was denied; Pershing played Oak Park — minus Jackson, Jones and Richardson — for the district title Tuesday night in Ferndale.

"Everyone else has played a game, and we're still sitting here."

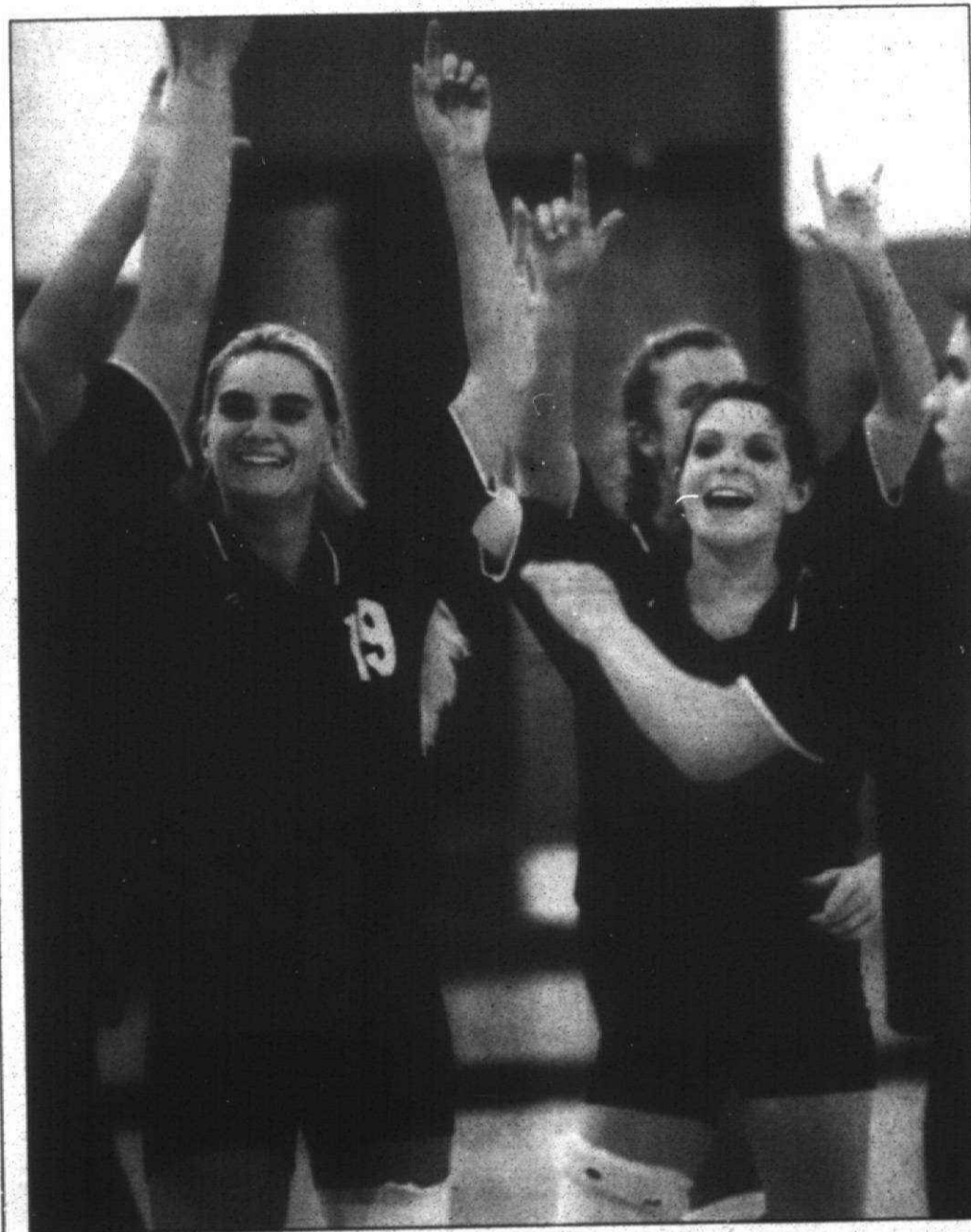

The Lady Crusaders (47-11 overall) clinched their second berth in three years by winning the Great Lakes Regional Championship with a hard-fought 16-14, 15-12, 6-15, 2-15, 15-8 win over Taylor (Ind.) in the finals Saturday at University of Michigan-Dearborn.

"We're very excited about this and it's great to get what I feel these girls deserve," said Madonna coach Jerry Abraham, who guided the Crusaders to a fifth-place NAIA National finish in 1993. "We've pointed to this all season long and I'm very pleased with this group because they've worked their butts off, starting with the preseason."

Kelly McCausland, a 5-foot-11 junior from Redford Union, was voted Regional tournament MVP. She had a total of 99 kills, including 24 each in wins over Taylor and Mount Vernon Nazarene (Ohio), the latter match going four games, 16-14, 15-10, 13-15, 15-8.

McCausland also had a total of 67 digs as the No. 1-seeded Crusaders captured a total of five matches over the three-day tourney.

"I think it was our togetherness, the way we stuck together," McCausland said. "And we knew what we had to do."

Taylor, the fourth-seed, beat Grace (Ind.) to reach the finals, 16-14, 15-9, 15-8.

Taylor, which also received a bid to the 20-team Nationals, was led by the powerful hitting of 5-11 outside hitter Natalie Steele.

After winning a tight first game, Madonna found itself down 11-1 in the second game as Steele began to get on a roll.

The Lady Crusaders, however, regrouped to score 14 of the next 15 points to take a 2-0 lead in games, but Taylor roared back to win the next two to force a fifth and deciding game.

"Since both teams were going (to the nationals), we knew the pressure was off," McCausland said. "We just went out there and tried to have fun."

"We just tried to block her (Steele) and play defense because knew she'd get her kills like any other player would get."

McCausland offset the hitting of Steele with her slide-play tactics.

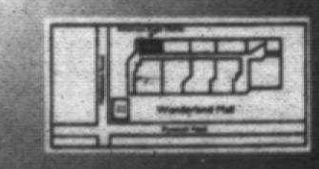

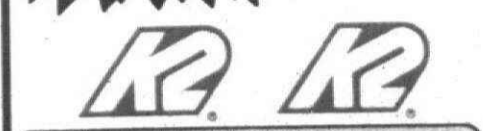

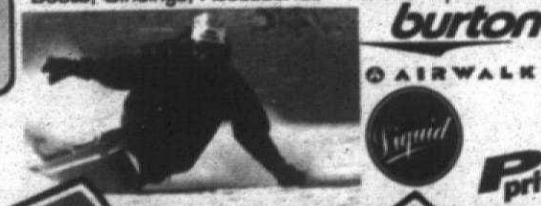

Hall of Famer: Robert Brody, who's developed land and built houses and apartments for nearly 50 years, will be inducted into the Building Industry Association of Southeastern Michigan Hall of Fame.

Brody headed for Hall of Fame

Robert Brody, a developer/builder, says he's constructed thousands of houses and apartment units and prepared hundreds of lots for other builders during a career that started in the late 1940s.

He's won Small Volume Builder of the Year honors from the National Association of Home Builders, helped start the Apartment Association of Michigan and served as president of the Building Industry Association of Southeastern Michigan.

But it's the little things that most stick in the memories of the 70-year-old Bloomfield Hills resident who will be inducted into the BIA Hall of Fame next week.

"What I really like best is going out when we're doing grading and smelling the raw ground," Brody said. "I used to take my grandsons out when they were four or five years old.

They used to sit in the seat of a big grader or stand next to the big tires. They loved it. I loved it.

"The most satisfaction you have is seeing what you've done, seeing you've created something people want," Brody said. "You've created homes for families, good homes, well built."

Brody was selected to the Hall of Fame for service to the association.

His first house, built with Paul Broder in Southgate in 1949, was a two-bedroom bungalow with a basement, unfinished attic, asbestos siding, living room, dining room and kitchen priced at \$8,995.

"We bought 124 lots. There was no down payment, and we sold out in one weekend," he said. "The war was over. There was a tremendous demand for housing."

Brody branched out into apartment construction and smaller strip shopping centers in the mid 1960s.

"The reason you want to go into

commercial and multiple is the building business has peaks and valleys," he said. "You're making a living off profit from a home and lot. When we're in a downturn, that stops. There's no profit, no livelihood."

Now, Brody spends most of his working efforts overseeing apartments in his portfolio including Fountain Park in Westland.

His most recent single-family development was Stratford Subdivision in partnership with Joe Block in Canton. He built his last house in Country Ridge Subdivision in Farmington Hills.

Brody's father, Samuel, built hotels in Detroit in the 1920s, so Brody kind of figured he'd end up in the building business himself. A son, Gerry, has followed him into the business.

While Brody's been at it nearly 50 years, he's not one to live in the good old days.

"Homes being built today, I think, are using better materials than we

used back then," he said. "Drywall is better than wet plaster because it's easier to repair, faster to work with. Poured basements use the same manpower but about one fifth the time."

Irvin H. Yackness, BIA executive vice president, has known Brody for years.

"He has never lost an optimistic outlook and a very puckish sense of humor," Yackness said. "All of his career, he has completely committed to his involvement with this association, and he is one of its strongest supporters."

For fun, Brody plays golf, reads and travels. He's married to Rhea and father to Jay, a tax and real estate lawyer, Cathy, a special education teacher, and Gerry.

"I loved it," Brody said of his long career. "There have been some unpleasant aspects in the sense you had homeowners, very few, you couldn't please. I wouldn't change. It's been very rewarding in every sense."

Tobin wins Builder of Year

enjoy creating, developing apartments or subdivisions and going in where there's nothing and creating something that becomes a good part of the community."

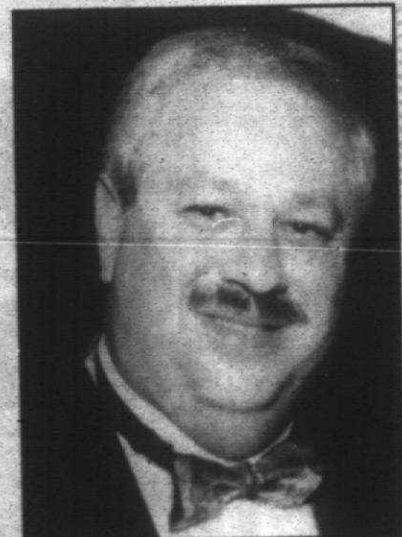
"To go in and do something, leave your mark, it's nice. That gives me pride," he said.

Ask lawyer whether he has malpractice insurance

REAL ESTATE QUERIES

Q. We are looking at attorneys and accountants for our condominium association. One of the persons on our board is in insurance and says that one of the questions we should ask our professionals is whether in fact they have malpractice insurance and in what amount. Do you think that is a reasonable request and a good idea for the association?

A. With any professional or contractor, you should inquire as to the extent and amount of insurance that that person has. In the case of an accountant and/or attorney, whether in fact the attorney and/or accountant has malpractice insurance is extremely important to protect the interests of the client.

It is legitimate for you to ask such questions to ensure that if in fact there is a problem with your professional, that there will be a reputable insurance company backing up the attorney or accountant regarding the availability of insurance coverage. Malpractice insurance is expensive, and some lawyers and accountants chose to go without.

While that may or may not be reflected in a lower fee to the association, it may also result in the association's having a claim against the attorney or accountant that may be uncollectible.

Q. Our deed restrictions require architectural drawings for new construction and give the association 30 days to reject any proposed construction plans. One of the homeowners wants to place a satellite dish on their property located in the subdivision governed by our association. The homeowner has notified the association as required and has gotten a permit from

the city to keep the satellite dish from going in.

A. In a recent case issued by the court of appeals, with similar facts, the court found that the provision requiring a 30-day period was enforceable and that the association could enforce the deed restriction against the satellite dish.

Obviously, each case depends on its own facts, however, and you are best advised to consult with counsel before taking any legal position.
