At long last

Great-great-grandmother becomes U.S. citizen in ceremony in Canton

itting in the family room of her Sgreat-grandson's Canton home, right hand held high, 98-yearold Maria Pappas listened to the Oath of Allegiance read by Kim Ogden, a deputy director of the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service.

Moments later, in front of dozens of friends and five generations of

family wearing and waving red, white and blue, Pappas said "so help me God." It was then official ... 78 years after coming to the United States, Pappas was finally an American citizen.

"I feel wonderful. It was all worth it," said Pappas. "At least I'm going to die happy now."

Not until the early 1980s, when she tried to get a passport to visit her homeland, did Maria find out she was a legal permanent resident, but not a U.S. citizen.

When Maria was 20, she came to the United States from the Greek island of Crete to marry Anthony Pappas.

After volunteering and fighting in World War I, Anthony Pappas was granted U.S. citizenship.


Gymnastics club plans \$1 million **building for Canton**



Increasing diversity in P-C schools affects programs, climate

quick look at the population figures of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools indicates it's a mostly white school district located in the affluent western suburbs of Wayne County. A place where there might be little thought to diversity, when you consider the 2000-01 Pupil Headcount Report from the Michigan Department of Education attests the district is nearly 86 percent white.

However, despite the overwhelming numbers, the community is growing, and the diverse population it's attracting is becoming significant. There are approximately 600 students, representing more than 30 languages, who are trying to learn English in the state's seventh-largest school district. And the numbers are constantly growing.

"The highest population of those students live in south Canton, where there is more affordable housing for people getting started," said Sue Shepard, the coordinator of the English as a Second Language-Bilingual department. "We live in an area many people want to be, where there is shopping, safe streets and employment. Many of those who come here know others who have moved here, people they can communicate with." Shepard began the ESL program

in 1981 with about 100 students. Now, that number is six times higher and climbs steadily by about 20 percent each school year.

"Language is everything, and everything depends on communication," she said.

The ESL program attempts to start the English-learning process early, working with elementary students a couple of hours a week.

"The younger kids learn faster because they make friends more quickly and the level of the English language is lower," said Shepard. Middle and high school students have ESL classes.

"The older the student, the harder it is to learn English," she said. "It's harder to jump into school and be successful because you need skills besides just English."

With the influx of a diverse population comes the need to understand others in order to live, work and play together.

"You presume there are less issues because of that," she said, "but when issues do arise, you have a network of resources to help resolve them before they become volatile."

In car cams for cops

In-car video cameras have been installed in most Canton Police Department patrol units.

The cameras went online Tuesday, according to Lt. Rob Crepe. The department will reap benefits, including lower prosecution costs, higher guiltyplea ratios and reduction of officer liability, from having the cameras in the patrol vehicles.

Cameras will record traffic stops and other activities by police officers. Cripe said audio will be included on the recordings. He noted that sounds can be recorded from several hundred feet away from the patrol vehicles.

The Canton Public Safety Department won a \$22,500 grant to help pay for the cameras. The grant came from the Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority, a joint-purchasing cooperative of local units of government which have banded together to secure stable, cost-effective insurance coverage.

MADD ribbon campaign

The Canton Police Department is participating in the "Tie One on for Safety" campaign sponsored by Mothers Against Drunk Driving. The campaign asks that everyone place a red ribbon on a visible location of their vehicle as a reminder to drive sober during the holiday season and throughout the year.

Canton Police Sgt. Charles Raycraft attended a kick-off ceremony on Nov. 20 at the Detroit Athletic Club.

"We feel it's a very worthwhile campaign," he said.

Nationally, alcohol-related traffic fatalities were up by 4.1 percent last year from 1999. In Canton, Raycraft said the numbers are better. The number of drunk-driving arrests decreased by 10.6 percent throughout September of this year.

"Awareness campaigns and programs are a great way to reduce the number of alcoholrelated traffic fatalities," Raycraft added.

Canton residents can pick up their free M.A.D.D. ribbon at the police department's first floor service desk or at the second-floor records bureau desk.







Canton police respond to several car-deer accidents

On the day before hunters headed to the woods last Thursday, motorists in Canton were bagging deer by accident. In a little more than an hour – between 5 and 6:30 p.m. – Canton police officers responded to three car crashes involving deer.

In each of the accidents, the deer survived the initial impact and had to be shot by officers.

While autumn is the most common time for car-deer accidents, it's hard to predict exactly where and when they'll occur.

Although most car-deer crashes occur in the most rural areas, Canton had 44 deer crashes last year according to the Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

"It's hard to pick where because we've had them all over, even at Michigan Avenue and 1-275," said Canton Police Capt. Alex Wilson. "They usually happen anywhere there's a wooded area close by." The crashes last Wednesday occurred at Palmer and Lotz roads, Van Born and Lil-

ley, and Ford west of Canton Center. Autumn is the most common time of year for car-deer crashes for two reasons, according to Wilson.

"It seems like the weather affects their movement. As soon as we get a good hard frost, you see the deer go on the move, and when they're on the move, they sometimes are moving across roads," he said.

The other reason is autumn is mating season for deer, and often male deer are focused more on mating than on automobiles, according to Wilson.

The time of day to watch for deer crossing the road is just after dark or right before dawn.

While the majority of all car crashes happen between 3 and 6 p.m., crashes involving deer are most likely between 6 and 9 a.m., followed by 9 p.m. to midnight according to SEMCOG.

Drivers who hit a deer should contact

the police as soon as possible.

"It's ideal if you can maintain visual contact with the deer until an officer shows up," Wilson said. "Very often the deer will sustain serious injuries and if you can keep track of it, the officer can put the animal out of its pain if necessary."

If it's not possible to remain near the deer, Wilson said calling the police as soon after the accident as possible is helpful.

"Another thing people may not know is that if you accidentally hit a deer, you're entitled by state law to keep it. You can ask an officer to fill out a deer permit, which they carry right in the car with them," Wilson said.

Most car-deer crashes occur in October, November and December, usually on dark, unlighted roads during the early morning or late evening commuting hours. Deer crashes are costly. The average insurance claim is about \$2,000, according to SEM-COG. Statewide, deer crashes cost at least \$130 million per year.





Senate attempts to end use of public dollars for campaigning

State senators are toughening up rules that prohibit a public body from using public funds to advocate a position on a ballot question or attempting to influence the outcome of an election.

In other words, they don't think city councils or school boards should be able to use taxpayers' money to try to convince those same taxpayers to approve a millage increase, as an example.

If Senate Bill 759, sponsored Issue tested by Sen. Beverly Hammerstrom, R-Temperance, is eventually passed the practice would be strictly banned. Senators have voted 20-15 on the bill and sent

cropped up in a recent election when the "Let Local Votes Count" proposal was on the ballot. The Michigan Municipal League campaigned vigorously on behalf of the proposal, which would have protected local control from state legislation.

But the MML was criticized

Both this attorney general and the previous one reviewed it and found it acceptable under Michigan law.

Following the Let Local Votes Count campaign, the state Chamber of Commerce challenged the MML's use of the money in court as well, and the judges agreed it passed muster under state law.

Hammerstrom explained the purpose of the ban was to keep non-profits from using dues as a way to funnel money out of public coffers and into campaign funds.

Sen. Dianne Byrum, D-Onondaga, noted that the issue of non-profits campaigning on ballot questions has been tested. She noted that the attorney general has ruled that funds stop being public funds as soon as they are paid out by cities or school districts.

Opponents of the bill argue it might be used to keep groups from campaigning just because they do business with a city or school district.

Hammerstrom added exemptions to the bill to allow those groups to use money made from goods and services on campaigns, just not dues or fees.

The accounts cannot be commingled if the money is to be used on a campaign.

Public bodies, such as schools or cities, are already prohibited from using public funds for campaigning, but the rules are not always clear. So when the Oakland County Intermediate School District attempted "informational" presentations about the recent school voucher ballot question, it got wrapped for crossing the line into advocating a position. Intermediate school officials said they didn't think they had crossed the line, but voucher proponents and the Secretary of State believed they

had. The district was ordered to stop using the presentation.

To clarify the rules, the bill requires that public bodies "maintain strict neutrality in each election."

The bills specify that it would not prohibit individual expressions of views by elected or appointed positions. Officials and government employees would not be barred from taking positions, but they could not do it on work time.

Nothing in the bill would stop public officials from participating in interviews, forums or debates.



However, unbeknownst to Maria, a change in the law and some lost paperwork left her without U.S. citizenship. She didn't find out until she wanted to return to her native Crete.

"It all fell through the cracks," said her granddaughter, Maria Sterlini, of Canton. "We all helped her along in the process because this was very important to her."

Four years ago, after recovering from several illnesses, Maria Pappas and her family set out to correct the problem. And, three weeks ago, the INS gave Pappas a test in her Dearborn Heights home, which she passed with fly-

ing colors.

"It's absolutely amazing," said great granddaughter Lynda Holtz, 28, of Canton. "She is so happy right now. She is truly proud to be an American.'

Members of the East Middle School choir were on hand to sing patriotic songs, and the festivities had an affect on students who witnessed the swearing-in ceremony.

"It's a special thing to witness someone becoming an American citizen, and be able to be a part of it," said Danielle Silletti, 12, of Plymouth. "Being a U.S. citizen is something we don't ordinarily think about."

"In light of what happened Sept. 11, it's been terrific and has more meaning," said Maria Sterlini.

Pappas was given a flag, plaques and proclamations from several members of Congress, including Lynn Rivers (D-Ann Arbor), who attended the ceremony.

the Michigan House 104-0 recently.

House Bill 4195 requires nursing homes to designate an individual to serve as a resident representative who will act as a liaison between a nursing home and a resident or his or her surrogate decision-maker to resolve complaints and respond to inquiries or requests on an informal basis.

The representative would have to be on duty and on site 24 hours per day, seven days a week.

"Based on numerous communications problems I have witnessed in the nursing home industry, I believe this is an important step in opening the lines of discussion between the resident, their families and the industry as a whole," Patterson said.

"Having a person on site to answer questions, help facilitate discussions and solve problems 24 hours a day, seven days a week will help ease the minds of nursing home residents across the state and will help provide a better quality of care. Residents need their questions answered and their problems solved in a timely manner. The resident representative will ensure that happens."

To assist the nursing home resident representative in performing his or her duties, the state Department of Consumer and Industry Services will post relevant information on its Web site, including links to federal and state regulations and rules governing the nursing home industry; any scheduled training sessions; and a list of long-term care contact phone numbers that would have to include the CIS 24-hour hotline and the state long-term care ombudsman.

there have been controver-

sies in the high schools surrounding Gay Aware-Iness Month, Black History Month and, most Frecently, those of Arabic or Indian descent since the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11.

There didn't seem like there was a lot of intersest in other ways of life before the Sept. 11 attacks," said Richard Wilson, a member of the high school's student Diversity Council. "There were people harassing Arabs and Indians, and anyone who looked like the same race as Osama bin Laden. Then, there was an outcry from students who said "This isn't right, we shouldn't be treating people this way.'

The Diversity Council is only one of many groups that help students learn about other cultures. There's an African-American Association, Middle Eastern European Association, the Asian-Pacific American Club, and others for Italian, Polrish and Indian Americans. Plus, the Gay-Straight -Alliance was formed to understand issues surfrounding those who are homosexual.

"This is a very diverse school, and we learn to accept and cooperate with everyone and be friends," said Tanya Haddad, 17, of Plymouth Township. The Salem High School senior said coming from a mostly Arabic school in Dearborn made her uneasy with the diversity at the Plymouth-Canton high school complex. However, she admittedly learned to stop judging others with the thelp of the Diversity Council. "I learned to accept that this is how it is in life. This is America, the melting pot."

Salem High School senior Ebinehita Arhebamen, 16, of Plymouth, has participated in leadership conferences sponsored by the National Conference for Community and Justice, where diversity awareness, conflict resolution and racism challenges are part of the program. Growing up in Detroit, there was only one white person in her class, who was tall, had big feet and extremely long hair.

"I thought all white people looked like that. But, when we moved here in sixth grade I found out it wasn't true," she said. "Now it's funny. But, back then it was pretty dumb.

"All my best friends are different ethnicities," she said. "After a while, if they're your friends, you don't see color, you see personalities." Becca Precht, 16, a Salem High School junior from Canton, said she likes the idea of being educated along with nearly 5,000 other students. "There are 5,000 different perspectives," she

said. "I think it's cool because you get to know about people and their backgrounds."

Diversity Council advisor Lynn Sandman said students come into the council without a lot of expectations.

"But after the experiences we offer them, their horizons are broadened, their awareness about themselves and other people, prejudices and biases have increased, and they become a more wellrounded person and better able to handle life experiences," she said.

Of course, not all students in Plymouth-Canton share the views of those who have participated in the Diversity Council or other ethic groups. To those students, Wilson says, "If they don't understand, God bless them."

"We like to think we have depth, we don't lose a lot when we go to the bench," Winfield said.



Moton-Spruill contributes at Ocelots rip JV foe, 99-36

The much-traveled Yaku Moton-Spruill apparently has found a home.

The 6-foot-8, 255-pound center from Westland John Glenn continued his consistent play by scoring 15 points and grabbing nine rebounds as Schoolcraft College rolled to a 99-36 men's basketball win Friday at home over an outmanned St. Francis (Ind.) junior varsity team.

Mike Williams, a 6-7 forward for Detroit City, finished with a game-high 29 points. Guard Javon Clark (Detroit Cass Tech) chipped in with 11.

Four others had eight points apiece for the 6-0 Ocelots including University of Detroit-Mercy signee Rulon Harris, North Farmington's Emir Medunjanin, Ronald Dorsey and Julius Austin.

Moton-Spruill could be the key to the Ocelots' hopes. Although he may not be as talented offensivley as last year's center, Sam Hoskin (now at DePaul), Moton-Spruill has shown he can run the floor, be a force inside defensively and be an effective rebounder.

And he is putting up the offensive numbers so far, averaging 14.8 points per game.

Last year he played sparingly at Paris Junior College (Tex.) before deciding to return home. In high school, Moton-Spruill showed promise as a sophomore at Glenn, but transferred to prep high school power Mount Zion Christian Academy (N.C.) before returning back to Glenn for a lackluster senior year.

"We share the ball, we're one squad on the court, that's the big difference," Spruill-Moton said. "And our coach (Carlos Briggs) is really here for us. He's there from 6 a.m. until whatever time is needed at night.

"He helps us anywhere he can, whether it's the books or basketball. He's our sixth man.'

The St. Francis JV squad was no match for the Ocelots, who roared out to a 22-3 lead. The Ocelots led 51-26 at halftime and continued their relentless defensive effort, holding the NAIA

school from Fort Wayne without a point for the first eight minutes of the second half while going on a 28-0 run.

Nick Nakenbrook, a 6-2 guard, and Jeremy Rice, a 6-9 center, each scored 13 for St. Francis, which fell to 0-3.

"We have three kids who are varsity players and they did well, but three guys aren't going to do much against a good, strong team like that," St. Francis coach Gay Martin said of the Ocelots. "They (Schoolcraft) are very, very good. We can't jump with them and they took us out of anything we attempted to do. I don't even know if we gave them a workout."

Williams, the MVP of the College of Southern Idaho Tourney, scored 17 of his points during the first 11 minutes of the second half.

After sitting out last year because of academics, Williams seems to have matured as a player both on and off the court.

'We're unselfish, we work hard to help each other," Williams said. "When somebody makes a mistake, we don't get on each other.'

Many thought Schoolcraft's level of play would drop off a bit after going 32-4 and making its first-ever NJCAA Division I Tournament appearance.


But so far that doesn't seem to be the case.

"People came out and didn't give us the respect because we lost a lot of guys," Williams said. "But these guys are coming out with something to prove. My role before was to come in and contribute, but now my role is much bigger."

"I thought we played unselfish," said Briggs, who is 112-23 in five years. "After a long road trip against three hard teams I thought we were able to stay focused, and that's what we have to do throughout the season.

"Defensively we're not bad right now. It's easy to give up baskets when you're up 25 or 30 points, but they stayed focused."







Daylight alters habits

After the from change daylight savings time to standard time, and the change ness becomes very noticeable.

Animals and plants are very sensitive to this change also.

demonstrated in animals, daylight length is a very important stimulus to release specific behaviors.

For example, animals start preparing for hibernation when the temperatures are warm because the daylight length period is getting shorter.

Trees are also sensitive to this stimulus. The abscission layer that forms between the stem and the leaf's point of attachment starts to form before the cold temperatures of fall.

Internal fluids start to move down into the roots for winter storage and protection before cold temperatures.

It is important for plants and animals to be prepared before the onset of consistently cold weather.

The influence of light on trees came to mind when my son pointed out that the leaves of trees directly beneath freeway lights were still attached to the branches.

Leaves on the other parts of the same tree had fallen, but those close to the bulb were slightly green.

I'm not sure what the correct explanation for this phenomenon is, but the fact that it happens when the leaves are close to the lights must correlate with either the light, or the heat produced from the lights, or both.

Most of these freeway lights are either sodium or tungsten/mercury vapor lights. Both of these lights produce a lot of heat. Leaves close to the lamps will not be affected by

frost like leaves more distant from the lamp.

Those leaves close to the lamp are in constant light. They do not have a light-dark cycle like other leaves in the area.

Leaves closest to the lamp also get the most intense light, probably enough to "fool" the branches into reacting like it was summer.

People who care for Christmas cactus plants know that they need to be put in a dark room for a period of time in order to stim ulate them to bloom at the proper time.

Hot house growers also take advantage of the light cycle when they induce plants to flower by duplicating the natural daylight cycle for blooming.

At the nature center live cold blooded animals on display nor mally enter a state of hiberna tion during winter.

Since it's not very exciting for patrons to watch a "sleeping" animal, caretakers change their light cycle to duplicate summer conditions. This stimulus is enough to keep them active in winter.

Not too long ago when we had 60-degree temperatures, I was hearing frogs calling in the woods. Both spring peepers and chorus frogs were singing.

Warm temperatures kept them active enough, but the daylight length was similar enough to spring time that they thought it was time to sing.

If they stayed active long enough they would realize that the daylight length period was not getting longer, it was getting shorter.

That is the stimulus that indi cates it's not time to court and mate, its time to hibernate.

Man produces a lot of light during darkness but it does not seem to have had much of a neg ative affect on plants and animals. It is a very important factor that plants and animals have relied upon for thousands of vears.

Let me know if you have seen any other impacts on wildlife from artificial lights.



In the background, Alice Gomez's compact disc, While the Eagle Sleeps: Night Songs and Lullabies of the Native American Flute, sends out a soothing stream of sound. Music is one of Horn's favorite gift ideas, especially CDs by Gomez, who was in town recently for a performance of one of her compositions by the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra, and a drumming workshop at Native West.







Both hold doctorates, he in theory and composition from Boston University, she in musicology from Columbia University. She made her debut as a pianist at age 8 with Leopold Stokowski and the NBC Symphony Orchestra. He's noted as a composer as well as a pianist. Both teach music, he at Aaron Copeland School of Music at Queens College in New York, she at C.W. Post campus of Long Island University. And both give concerts, as soloists and as a


duo, here and abroad. Last summer they performed in Switzerland then went on to the Czech Republic to hear the Moravian Symphony perform and record Brings' Scherzi Musicale.

"It takes a lifetime of practice, years to get as where you really think as one," said Chinn. "It's always interesting to see the give and take between musicians - and at one piano it's even more important. The repertoire is not too often performed. Much of what we play is original or transcribed for four hands.

Here are a few traveling tips. Bring your birth certificate and photo identification. It's about a six hour flight from Michigan




you'll have to watch for the cows, goats, chickens ... and speed bumps."



Innovation marks Ceretto wines from Piedmont region of Italy

ention of Italy's Piedmont region conjures up tastes of robust red wines such as Barbaresco and Barolo, both made from the nebbiolo grape. Mention also brings to mind Ceretto, the region's innovative producer.

Why Ceretto? To answer this, let's step back in time about 30 years when the Ceretto brothers Bruno and Marcello became the source of Piedmont winemaking innovations. Back then, they were the first to introduce stainless steel tanks for fermentation of red wines. They pioneered what is now considered the modern style of Bar-

rom the sun-drenched orchards of the Mediterranean comes one of nature's perfect foods, the olive. And from the olive comes one of man's greatest culinary creations, olive oil.

"Besides being polyunsaturated and good for you, it's one of the best foods in the world." said Chef Bob Gascoigne of Ernesto's restaurant in Plymouth. "It is amazing the flavor you get out of olive oil. There is no substitute in my book."

Olive oil is one of the world's oldest foods. According to A Guide to Good Olive Oil, written by Ari Weinzweig, owner of Zingerman's in Ann Arbor, a carrier of select oils, olive oil was first cultivated in the Eastern Mediterranean about 6,000 years ago.

Leave it to the industrious Greeks to have raised the oil to new commercial and culinary heights, followed by the Romans, whose cooking culture - at least for Americans - remains most associated with the golden-green liquid.

Today, olive trees are grown in many places where sun and soil marry in harmony - from South America to Mexico to the California Coast. Zingerman's even carries an olive oil from New Zealand.

"Unless you are in New Zealand, there is no other place to get this olive oil," said Todd Wickstrom, a managing partner at Zingerman's. "We got some in last year and loved it. It sold so well we bought the entire harvest."

Taste

The taste of olive oil is influenced by many factors: soil, climate, variety of olive, vintage, harvest time and method of process, such as "cold pressing," which uses stone wheels and generates no heat. In addition, each growing region - Tuscany in Italy, Catalonia in Spain and Provence in France, to name three imparts its own flavor characteristics.

Choosing a good olive oil is simple: Taste a few, and pick the one you like. But taste often. said Weinzweig. "Anybody who is interested in learning about olive oil- car, rashe the dit ference. If you der't to through have enough taste memory."

If you're an olive oil neophyte, keep in mind that the traditional Mediterranean oils have a stronger flavor than seed oils, such as corn and soy. Newly pressed oils especially have a

more peppery or bitter finish, a good trait in moderation but bad if overpowering. These oils are sometimes referred to as "one or two cough" oils. After the oil has slipped past your palate and hits the back of your throat, you cough.

As olive oils mature, they soften.

Chef Marco Conte, owner of Marco's Restaurant in downtown Farmington, prefers the mellow, buttery taste of a mature olive oil that enhances rather than overwhelms a dish like grilled eggplant, roasted peppers or a delicate tomato-basil salad. The newer, more peppery oils are best left for heartier fare, such a grilled lamb chops.

Conte has his favorites, San Guiliano and Olio d'Gaeta, both extra-virgin, cold pressed and Italian, of course. About the San Guiliano, he said, "It's absolutely wonderful." The Gaeta is named after his father's birthplace near Rome. "It's a classic olive oil, not too bitter, not too buttery. It's right in the middle. It doesn't overpower. It just adds flavor."

While color is not always the prime indicator of taste, the greener oils do tend to be fruitier and full-flavored, said Weinzweig. He warns that there are ways for processors to make low-grade, flavorless oil greener in color. Just throw in some olive leaves during pressing and the chlorophyll in the leaves imparts color but not flavor.

Grade

The term "extra virgin" has nothing to do with an olive's behavior, nor is it a redundant term. "Extra virgin" refers to a grade of olive oil, usually indicating the highest quality. Extra virgin olive oils are naturally low in levels of free oleic acid, less than 1 percent.

The higher the free acid level, the lower the grade of olive oil, writes Weinzweig. " 'Virgin' olive oil has two to three times the free acid of an extra virgin oil. 'Pure' olive.oil - the chemically refined stuff they sell at the supermarket - is the lowest grade, with the most free and soll on the least flavor."

³³ - thereby issues a warning, hi today's high-tech world, it is possible to chemically remove or reduce free acidity from lowgrade oils to get an "extra virgin" classification. The antidote is simple, he said. "Buy from a reputable olive oil seller and taste before you buy."

As expected from a top-quality producer, Ceretto's single vineyard wines are produced only in the best years. In the decade of the 1990s, the best vintages are 1996, 1997, and 1999. If you wish to cellar some Ceretto red wines. it's good to remember this.

New generation

Ceretto continues as a family operation. At age 24, Federico Ceretto is now following his father Bruno's footsteps in worldwide sales and marketing.

His 25-year-old cousin Alessandro, Marcello's son, has assumed the role of his father as winemaker. At age 29, Federico's sister Roberta is in charge of public relations and Alessandro's sister Lisa serves as company administrator.

Sampling Ceretto wines recently with Federico during dinner at Fonte d'Amore in Livonia, we experienced the vibrant energy of young wines and the enthusiasm of a new generation settling comfortably into roles within a family business.

"With the 1998 vintage," said Federico, "my generation has launched a new Ceretto wine called Monsordo Rosso (\$39). It is our first blend of cabernet sauvignon, syrah, pinot noir, nebbiolo, and merlot. As a blend of French varieties and nebbiolo, all vinified separately, it is a new-age concept for the Piedmont, making the statement that the Cerettos are continuing their innovations with the new generation."



a continuum of taste, from light and buttery to spicy and peppery and everything in between. "The ones we really like taste like olives," said Todd

Wickstrom, managing partner.

Zingerman's specializes in oils from smaller growers, who harvest, crush and bottle the oil at the same location. Such oils are known as "single estate" oils and are invested with human passion. Zingerman's also carries a few flavor-infused oils, such as *Limonato* from Italy, which owner Ari Weinzweig describes as the "oil of angels."

However, most of their olive oils are of such a high quality they can stand alone. Staff member Allison Schraf provides this taste tour:

I Lecci - This light golden oil comes from the Lake Garda region near the Alps in northern Italy, which is not generally known for its olive oil. The harvest is small, and Zingerman's buys one half of it, a few thousand liters. The taste is buttery, with some interesting fruity flavors. Priced at \$44.99.

"This is what we would call a light and elegant oil. It has plenty of flavor. but is not aggressive," said Schraf.

Nicolas Alziari - Fewer than 10 percent of the world's olive oil production comes from France. The golden-green Nicolas Alziari is one of the finest. It has a

he olive oils at Zingerman's in Ann Arbor represent more olivey, heavier mouth feel. Price: \$29.99 "It took us 10 years to get this in the store," said Schraf. "We had to convince them that we will respect the food. Almost everybody will like this olive oil." Maussane - Another fine olive oil from Provence,

France, Maussane has a serious cult following. It is greener than other oils, with a long flavor profile, more enduring mouth feel, and a very complex. longer finish. said Schraf. Maussane starts with a grassy taste, followed by a fruitiness or nuttiness, then ends with a peppery finish.Priced at \$50.99 for a liter, \$28.99 for a halfliter.

"If you love olives, this is your olive oil. It's all about sun-drenched olives," said Schraf.

Mariano's - This unfiltered olive oil comes from central western Spain, where its producer is very involved in the traditional food movement. It has a grassy, apple taste that personifies spring. Zingerman's buys the entire harvest. Priced at \$29.99.


The cloudy sediment on the bottom is a good thing. This oil is not overly processed," said Schraf.

Castello della Paneretta - Produced near Florence, Italy, this single-grove produced soil has been described as "assertive but smooth, followed by a peppery kick." It is full-flavored and deep green with golden highlights. Priced at \$24.99 for 500 ml.

"It can grab you," said Schraf."

San Vito - A deep gold oil, San Vito is produced in the Marché region. It has a stronger, more peppery finish that could stand up to strong greens, such as arugula, raddichio and escarole, or sit nicely on top of a hearty bowl of minestrone. Priced at \$29.99 for 750 ml.

"This is a stop-and-take-notice oil," said Schraf. Zingerman's is located at 422 Detroit Street, Ann Arbor, (734) 663-9304.

The 1998 Ceretto Asij Barbaresco (\$44) has a bright concentration of cherries, plums, and red currants. While the vintage does not rank at the top in the 1990s, it's drinking superbly now and will age well.

For Barolo, the Piedmont's renowned and expensive wine, Ceretto offers several choices. The 1996 Zonchera Barolo (\$44) has blackberry fruit with nuances of anise and mushrooms. With good grip, this more affordable Barolo is excellent with long-cooked meat dishes. At \$68, both the 1995 Bricco Rocche Brunate Barolo and Bricco Rocche Prapo Barolo illustrate the differences created by vineyard site. Prapo is a blockbuster while Brunate is about elegance and less power. Brunate from 1997 at \$83 is a rich, generous, warm and welcoming wine from an outstanding vintage.

Although Ceretto is known for its red wines, the full, yet crisp 2000 Arneis Blange (\$22) proved to be a rich and delightful white wine to accompany veal with tuna sauce. A dazzling finish to any meal is the low-alcohol, off-dry 2000 Ceretto Moscato d'Asti "Santo Stefano."



Keeping fit with some fabulous fall soups

When the weather turns brisk, there's nothing cozier than a big bowl of hot soup.

Autumn is the perfect time to warm the kitchen with stovecooked soups made with the season's harvest of squashes, pumpkin, cabbage and root vegetables. Hearty, homemade soups need little monitoring while they slowly simmer, leaving the cook free for other activities. The payoff comes at serving time, when the taste of homemade beats out commercial soups every time.

One benefit of soups comes to light when they are used as starters to meals. They are filling as well as nutritious, so they help to cut down portion sizes, and calories, of most entrées.

Want a marvelous-tasting soup that's simple yet elegant? While baking butternut squash or steaming it in the microwave, sauté a mixture of onions and celery. Place cooked squash and sautéed vegetables in a blender with low-fat milk and purée, in small batches if necessary. Sea-

son with lemon juice and a pinch each of allspice, cumin, salt and pepper.

When you don't have time to cook from scratch, jump-start your soup by using canned soup for a base. To a can of condensed tomato soup and a can of chicken broth, add a package of frozen spinach, a pinch each of basil, oregano and thyme. Simmer until spinach is tender and add salt and pepper to taste. Top with grated low-fat cheese and serve. For a heartier version, toss in chopped cabbage, green pepper, zucchini, carrots, or potatoes along with the spinach.

Stir up some pumpkin soup. In a blender, combine a 15-ounce can of unsweetened pumpkin purée with one-third cup of peanut butter and two cups of chicken stock. Purée until smooth, transfer to a saucepan and simmer over medium heat about 15 minutes, until hot and creamy. Stir in one-fourth cup of green onions, reheat until bubbly, then serve.

CABBAGE AND TOMATO SOUP

1 Tbsp. canola oil

2 medium onions, chopped

1 medium carrot, grated

1 medium leek, white part only, chopped

1 head cabbage, quartered and sliced crosswise into 1/2-inch strips, about 6 cups

1 can (15 oz.) diced tomatoes, with liquid

4 cups vegetable stock or canned broth

1/2 cup old-fashioned rolled oats, or steel-cut type

1/2 - 1 tsp. dried thyme, as desired

1/2 tsp. sugar 1 bay leaf

Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

In a large Dutch oven or saucepan, heat oil over mediumhigh heat. Add onion, carrot and leek and stir to coat with the oil. Cover pot tightly, reduce heat to medium-low and cook 10 minutes. Mix in cabbage, cover pot and cook another 10 minutes, until cabbage is wilted.

Stir in tomatoes, stock, oatmeal, thyme, sugar and bay leaf. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Bring to boil, reduce heat to simmer and cook, uncovered, until oatmeal is cooked and cabbage is tender, about 20 minutes if using rolled oats (30 minutes for steelcut oats).

Serve immediately. Store unused soup in refrigerator. Chilled soup will absorb liquid, so add more broth, as needed, when reheating. Makes 6 servings.

Paella proves rich dishes are good for soul

CONCORD, N.H. (AP) -Miyoko Nishimoto Schinner started dabbling with vegetarianism when she was 12, but it wasn't long before she grew weary of what she calls "stoic" animal-free fare.

"It was the late '60s, so I made a lot of the 'organic type' food for which vegetarianism got a bad name – carob brownies, soy burgers and lentil casseroles,' she writes in "The New Now and Zen Epicure" (Book Publishing Company, 2001, \$19.95).

That didn't last. Schinner loves food, and she loves it to taste good. Before long, her food philosophy, and the roots of her cookbook, took form - healthy food need not taste "healthy."

"A little rich food will occasionally do wonders for a person's soul," she wrote. "The Greeks had a god of wine named Dionysus who punished those who broccoli and bok choy, which were too strict with themselves and would not join in the revelry. So don't be afraid."

Schinner certainly isn't. Her book is full of rich dishes that range from an eggplant pate she says will be mistaken for its liver counterpart, to a chocolate raspberry torte that contains no eggs, dairy products or even flour.

For a tasty treat, try Schinner's paella, which combines the delicate flavor of olive oil with more assertive saffron, red wine and garlic.

Traditional paella is a feisty Spanish rice dish named for the pan in which it is cooked. It usually includes a wide variety of meats, from seafood to frog legs to fowl.

Schinner's version is a perfect fall dish, as it welcomes just about any vegetable, from crisp peppers to supple eggplant. She does advise avoiding cabbage.

PAELLA (Preparation 30 minutes) 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil

Add the rice and saffron and cook until slightly nutty, about 5 to 10 minutes. Add remaining ingredients except the sliced vegetables and bring to a simmer.

After 5 minutes add the vegetables. Cover loosely, reduce flame to low and cook for about 15 minutes, stirring every few minutes until the rice is tender. Add more broth if the liquid in the pan dries out. Serve hot.





Relaxation – Manipulation of stressed areas of the body react by releasing endorphins, calming the nervous system and allowing the muscles to relax.

Macular Degeneration

Research conducted in part at Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak reveals that a dietary supplement of high levels of antioxidants and zinc significantly reduces the risk of vision loss associated with advance age-related macular degeneration (AMD). These findings from a nationwide clinical trial - the Age-Related Eve Disease Study - are reported in the October issue of Archives of Ophthalmology. Researches found that people at high risk of developing advanced stages of AMD lowered their risk by about 25 percent when treated with a high-dose combination of vitamin C, vitamin E, beta-carotene, and zinc. In the same high-risk group – which includes people with intermediate AMD or advanced AMD in one eye but not the other eye - the supplements reduced the risk of vision loss caused by advanced AMD by about 19 percent. For those study participants without AMD or early AMD, the supplements did not provide an apparent benefit. "For people at high risk for developing advanced AMD, these dietary supplements are the first effective treatment to slow the progression of their disease," said ophthalmologist Dr. Alan Ruby, who led the research at Beaumont. "It's important to note that the supplements are not a cure for AMD, nor will they restore vision already lost from the disease."

Treatment offers hope for chronic bed-wetters

muresis is a difficult word for some to pronounce, but for many it is also a difficult condition to discuss. However, a local woman is encouraging the discussion because talking is one step toward curing enuresis, or involuntary urination.

Barbara Moore, director and founder of the **Enuresis Treatment Center in Farmington Hills.** claims to have helped a variety of people stay dry since opening the facility 25 years ago. With the help of ever-improving technology, she has even reached people who live outside the United States via the Internet.

"We treat children and adults all over the world Russia, Japan, Germany and England," she said, "These are very bright people. I have treated one teenager in Russia who speaks five languages, but she just couldn't get any help with the bed-wetting."

Defining enuresis

Enuresis afflicts people in two ways: nocturnal enuresis, or primary enuresis, which accounts for 75 percent of enuretics and occurs in people over 5 years of age who were never toilet trained at night; or secondary enuresis, which describes enuretics who were completely toilet trained for more than six months.

The cause of enuresis is debatable. Moore, who admits her theories are steeped in research, trial and error, insists that bed-wetting is not a psychological disorder. She attributes the wetting to "an inherited sleep disorder which can be triggered by intense stress.

Dr. Bassam Bashour, a Henry Ford Hospital pediatric nephrologist for 23 years, disagrees. He argues there are a number of reasons someone becomes enuretic, including a troubled psychosis. First, he looks at an enuretic's medical condition. If tests do not point to infection or kidney disease, then he looks at an enuretic's behavioral, emotional and psychological well-being, as well as the family tree.

"Only 50 percent (of the primary patients) have the gene in the family," he said.

Identified as the 12 and 13 Q-chromosome, the sleep disorder gene strikes males harder than females, a ratio of 60-to-40. The genetic disorder causes people to fall into such a deep sleep that they cannot wake up. Moore said it is the same disorder that leads to sleep apnea, sleep walking and night terrors.

Without the disorder, you could not sleep

pattern. Her team of teachers, certified nurses and psychologists focuses on teaching people how to manipulate the sleep pattern to stay dry.

Bashour, on the other hand, believes people naturally change their sleep pattern as they mature, often self-correcting the problem. He admits, however, that if they are not dry by age 5, it is prudent to look at sleep patterns as well as diet.

Talking about primary enuretics, Bashour said "up to 20 percent of children will continue (to wet the bed past the age 5.) But 50 percent of the 20 will be dry by age 7. Less than 1 percent will continue with the problem as an adult."

Fixing a problem

Denise (last names have been omitted for privacy) refused to let her son be part of the uncured class of patients. She had Benjamin, 9, tested at Children's Hospital in Detroit, but came up empty-handed. Desperate for a cure, Denise, a nurse, and her husband, a minister, allowed Benjamin to take DDAVP (Desmopressin Acetate,) a nasal spray touted to stop bed-wetting.

"It's supposed to stop it, but it didn't. It only slowed it down and we were concerned about the side effects. It can cause nose ulcers," said the Detroit mother.

For years, they restricted Benjamin's fluids and woke him up three times a night to use the bathroom, but nothing worked for the 4.0 honor student who continued to wet the bed three or four times a night.

"We were at our wits end." said Denise.

Her husband turned to the Internet for help. He found www.drybed.com, the Enuresis Treatment Center's Web site page. "We figured what did we have to

deeply even if you tried," she explained.

Moore and Bashour also disagree over the role maturity plays in enuresis. Moore tells clients from the beginning that the disorder does not go away as people grow older, unless they adjust their sleep

lose. I was keeping the laundry folks in business and no one was getting any sleep except for Benjamin," she said.

After two months of treatment, Benjamin had fewer accidents. After five months. Benjamin went one week without any accidents. He graduated from the program last July after 13 months of treatment.

Moore boasts that her program maintains a 95 percent success rate without intrusive physicals or medication.

"We work with muscle control and bladder development," she said. "We go to the core of the problem."

Medication not an answer

Bashour agrees that medication, which only cures the symptoms, should be avoided. Aside from the fact that medication only masks a problem, he is concerned that medication can jeopardize an enuretic's health. DAAVP has killed at least two people.

Other commonly prescribed treatments are Imipramine, an antidepressant that only works for 50 percent of the people as long as they take it (60 percent experienced a reoccurrence when they stopped taking the medication), alarm therapy and shock therapy, which are designed to wake enuretics so that they can use the bathroom.

"Alarm therapy does not work well because it wakes up everyone in the house except the enuretic, and shock therapy is a little drastic," said Bashour.

If the wetting is not attributed to a medical condition or genetics. Bashour opts for behavior modification, or changing the situation that causes children to wet the bed, and implementing a rewards system.

"For instance, if there has been a family crises and the child is being neglected emotionally, we modify the behavior of the parents," he said.

Behavior modification may also include changing diet. Bashour recommends that enuretics avoid high-salt and caffeinated items four to six hours before bed since they cause people to drink more fluids.

While treatment at the Enuresis Center averages six months for children 8-9 years old, longer for those who are older, Dr. Bashour is happy if his patients are dry for two months. "I'd prefer three, but I'll take two."

Bed wetting is a common problem, says the NKF

Bed-wetting, also called enuresis, is a common problem in children, especially in boys. An estimated 5 to 7 million children in the United States wet their beds on a regular basis, according to the National Kidney Foundation. Unfortunately, shame and embarrassment is a frequent by-product of the problem.

The NSF takes the stance that bed-wetting is usually not an emotional, learning or behavioral problem. Children do not wet the bed on purpose. However, children who do not get help for the problem or who are punished for bed-wetting are at risk to emotional or behavioral problems.

The NSF answers the following questions:

1. When is bed-wetting a problem? Most children stop wetting the bed at night by the time they are 4 or 5. Children who continue to wet should be assessed by a pediatrician or family doctor. In some cases bed-wetting occurs with daytime wetting and/or bowel problems. This may be a sign of more serious problems. Since infection of the urine can cause wetting in a few cases, every child with wetting needs to be checked.

2. What causes bed wetting?

In most cases, bed-wetting may be due to one or more of the following reasons:

The child does not awaken when the bladder is full

Some children produce more urine during

sleep than others

Other children have bladders that do not hold as much urine

Physical problems are uncommon causes of bedwetting but should be considered in every child. A good history, thorough physical examination and a urine test are usually all that is necessary to determine if a physical problem is likely.

3. Are there treatments for bed-wetting? (See above article for more details).

There are many different approaches to treating bed-wetting, including:Limiting a child's fluid intake before bedtime.

Waking the child periodically during the night

to go to the bathroom. This may help keep the bed dry, but it does not cure the problem.

Use a moisture alarm. Eventually the child will awaken to urinate before wetting or stay dry all night. Relapses occur, but 50 to 70 percent of children respond if treated four to six months.

Sticker charts and rewards can be useful. This can be combined with the moisture alarm to help motivate the child.

Medications may help. The two most commonly used are desmorpressin and imipramine. Both may have some side effects.

Hypnotherapy also may held. Children who can benefit from this treating usually show improvement within four to six sessions. More

studies are needed to determine how well this works

4. Does bed-wetting mean that a child has a kidney problem?

No. Most children who wet their beds do not have a kidney problem.

5. How can a parent help prevent long-term effects of bed-wetting?

Bed-wetting can affect a child's self-image and self-confidence. The best way to help prevent this is to reassure your child that bed-wetting is a common problem and that he or she will outgrow it. Do not be reluctant to use some form of treatment if you child desires it.

6. What are the chances that bed-wetting will not go away?

It may take some time for a child to outgrow the bed-wetting problem. Approximately 1 to 2 percent of bed-wetting children still have the problem by the time they are 15.

Children who never had a bed-wetting problem or who have been dry for some time may start bedwetting because of stress. Situations such as the birth of a sibling, parents' divorce or other major changes in a child's life can sometimes lead to bedwetting.

Financially fit survive when faced with being laid off

Layoffs are something many of us don't want o think about, out with the ecent economic lownturn and company mergrs, many employees are ealizing job ecurity can be leeting.

Whether or not you are curently faced with losing your job, now is a good time to assess your inancial needs and create a inancial survival plan. How well you adjust financially to any nterruption in your income is rucial to your finances, as well is to your personal well-being.

Here are some considerations when creating your financial survival plan:

Severance pay – Check f your employer offers severance pay in the event of certain terminations, such as a layoff. Severance pay varies widely from none at all to six months or more of your current salary. Some

companies may even reimburse to process all the necessary you for unused vacation or sick pay. In fact, some states mandate that unused vacation be paid as wages. You should check your own company's policies.

Depending on the arrangement, your employer may offer severance pay in a lump sum or in regularly scheduled paychecks. Taking it in a lump sum will provide you with the cash you may need until you land a new job. If the money is not needed immediately, you may consider investing it where it will earn interest.

Remember, though, severance pay will be treated as taxable income. If you take a lump sum, you could be taxed at a higher rate. To find out more about the tax implications, you should consult your tax specialist or attornev.

Unemployment benefits - If you are eligible, applying for unemployment immediately may allow you the cash flow needed for a short-term financial cushion. Don't wait. It could take two weeks or longer

paperwork.

There is no need to feel bashful; you and your employer have been contributing to this throughout your years of employment.

Loan deferrals -Some loans, such as student loans. offer payment deferral during periods of unemployment, which keeps more cash in your pocket. Applying for unemployment may be required for certain loan deferrals.

Health insurance – In 1985 the federal government passed the Consolidated **Omnibus Budget Reconciliation** Act, known as COBRA. Employers with 20 or more employees are generally required to offer the opportunity for employees to continue coverage for a specified period of time, ranging from 18-36 months.

COBRA is not cheap; you will generally end up paying the entire premium amount - that is the premium you paid as an active employee plus the monthly contributions that were paid by your employer (or more in some cases). In addition, there may be a 2 percent administration fee. However, setting aside some money for maintaining COBRA benefits enables you to guard against possible medical bills that could have a major negative impact on your financial situation. To learn more about how

COBRA can work for you, talk to your company's benefits department or check out the US. Department of Labor website at http://www.dol.gov/dol/pwba.

Additionally, your spouse or partner can check with his/her employer to determine if health care coverage is available for vou

Your 401(k) plan – In the event of a layoff, what happens to your 401(k) account? If the fund offerings and service match your investment needs, you can choose to keep your 401(k) account where it is (your plan may, however, provide for involuntary "cash-outs" if your account does not have more than \$5.000).

You can also choose to take a distribution or roll your account balance over to an IRA. A rollover might give your investment flexibility and can be converted to a Roth IRA, if you so choose. A distribution following a layoff may seem the easiest way to get needed cash, but the IRS requires the payer to automatically withhold 20 percent tax, and you may be subject to a ten percent IRS penalty fee.

There are many pros and cons to both the IRA rollover and early distribution options, so consulting a tax advisor and a qualified financial advisor would be wise when considering your overall financial goals.

Act now - During any period of unemployment, cash flow is crucial. You can start preparing now by putting away three to six months of expenses in an accessible account. Take note of any liquid investments. It could be just what you need to stay afloat until you find that next career opportunity.

You may also need to re-examine your budget to determine

Study: depressed employees take more sick days

A just-released longitudinal tud, adding to the growing body of scientific evidence on employe productivity, confirms that lepression is common in the workplace and detrimental to employee performance. These indings are reported in the May ssue of The American Journal of

Psychiatry, the monthly scientific journal of the American Psychiatric Association.

The study found that absenteeism due to health problems was twice as high for employees with depressive symptoms compared to those without depressive symptoms. The study also

revealed that the likelihood of decreased performance on the job is seven times higher for depressed employees.

The Yale University research investigators termed decreased productivity on the job as "presenteeism" and was a likely result of employee reluctance to report an illness or to consider depression a "legitimate reason" for taking sick leave.


"The perceived stigma associated with depressive disorders may thus result in a high propor-

tion of hidden costs to employers that are not readily evident from health or disability claims data," they said.

than 6,000 employees at three corporations took a close look at the relationship between depression, satisfaction with health care and employee productivity. The study also found that

employees who complained about their health careity of care were also more likely to be depressed.

for children 8-9 years old, longer for those who are older, Dr. Bashour is happy if his patients are dry for two months. "I'd prefer three, but I'll take two."

Appointments with Moore and Bashour are done every couple weeks after the initial visit or two. Patients at the Enuresis Treatment Center can expect to pay \$75 for the first appointment, but fees after that range in price depending on the extent of treatment. Treatment is not covered by insurance. On the flip side, treatment with Bashour is often covered through insurance.

How it began

Moore was inspired to open the center by her daughter, who began wetting the bed at age 6.

"I was just so frustrated because I couldn't find anyone to

help her. The pediatrician just kept saying she will outgrow it," she said. In the meantime, her daughter's self-esteem was decreasing and it began to affect her schooling.

According to Moore, people who wet the bed "feel a lot of shame. They feel different and think they are the only one who wets the bed."

In reality, Moore estimates that bed-wetting affects millions of Americans, both children and adults. With few treatment options and the continued inheritance of the sleep disorder gene, she expects the number will continue to rise.

For her part however, Moore offers hope to another generation of victims.

"We are now seeing parents who were treated here bringing their children here," she said.





UPDATE ON FIBROMYALGIA

Investigations continue into the cause of fibromyalgia. One feature of the condition that is clear is that individuals with fibromyalgia possess a heightened sensitivity to pain, noise, and touch. This high degree of reactivity reflects the activity of brain centers, which are set to respond at levels lower than for individuals without fibromyalgia.

Such responses are governed by receptors in brain nuclei and by the action of the brain to recycle chemicals like epinephrine, acetycholine, seratonin, and dopamine. Physicians know from experience that medications like paxil and prozac can change the chemical activities of these neurotransmitters, but the same experience indicates that these medications are not helpful in controlling the high sensitivity exhibited by patient with fibromyalgia. Trials are underway using medications of the paxil -prozac type but modified sufficiently to treat not depression but the the threshold of reactivity of patients with fibromyalgia. However, individuals with fibromyalgia while awaiting new medications, can take advantage of

the observations about reactions to stimuli. One way is to limit exposure to noise, whether it is people yelling or Saturday night disco sound. Avoiding excess in heat and cold is important. Bundling up for winter is not only a way to prevent a chill but will aid in preventing a flare of libromvalgia related pain.

Controlling anger, argument, and upset are of particular importance. Keeping even-tempeered will avoid shocks that send brain centers into an overactive response. Working to modify you live, work, and rest will always be important no matter what drugs come forward. www.drjweiss.yourmd.com

Check holiday lighting carefully to prevent hazardous situations

There is at least one certainty during winter in Michigan – homes, streets and shopping malls will be decorated with the colorful lights of the holiday season. It is crucial for home decorators to make sure lights

LARRY KAUFMAN make sure lights are used as the manufacturers intended them to be – for example,

indoor lights for indoor use only because they can be affected by moisture; outdoor lights should be used only outdoors because they burn hotter.

I tell family and friends that lights should be thrown away if they have frayed wires, damaged sockets and cracked or missing insulation. To reduce the possibility of electrical shock or fires, check for an Underwriters Laboratory (UL) label before stringing lights

ast and installing decorations.

Never assume that just because your lights worked effectively last year they will do so this year. A few minutes spent checking cords for potential hazards can possibly prevent a fire or worse. I suggest the following tips so everyone can enjoy safer holidays:

Indoor lighting

■ Do not overload electrical circuits.

■ Use not more than three sets of standard lights on each extension cord.

■ Do not insert new bulbs or change fuses when light sets are plugged in.

■ Keep lights away from carpeting, furniture and drapes.

■ Turn off decorative lights before you go to bed or leave home.

Outdoor lighting

■ Use only outdoor extension cords with molded plugs and sockets.

■ Keep all electrical connections off the ground and hang sockets downward to prevent water from seeping into them.

■ Do not run lighting cords through door or window openings where they can be damaged.

Meanwhile, if you are decorating your home with holiday lights, we'll have all the electricity you'll need.

During winter months the demand for electricity generally is less. As a result, during off peak evening hours there is more than enough electrical power for everyone's holiday light display.
