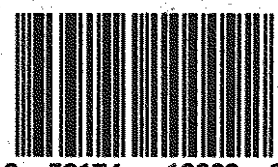

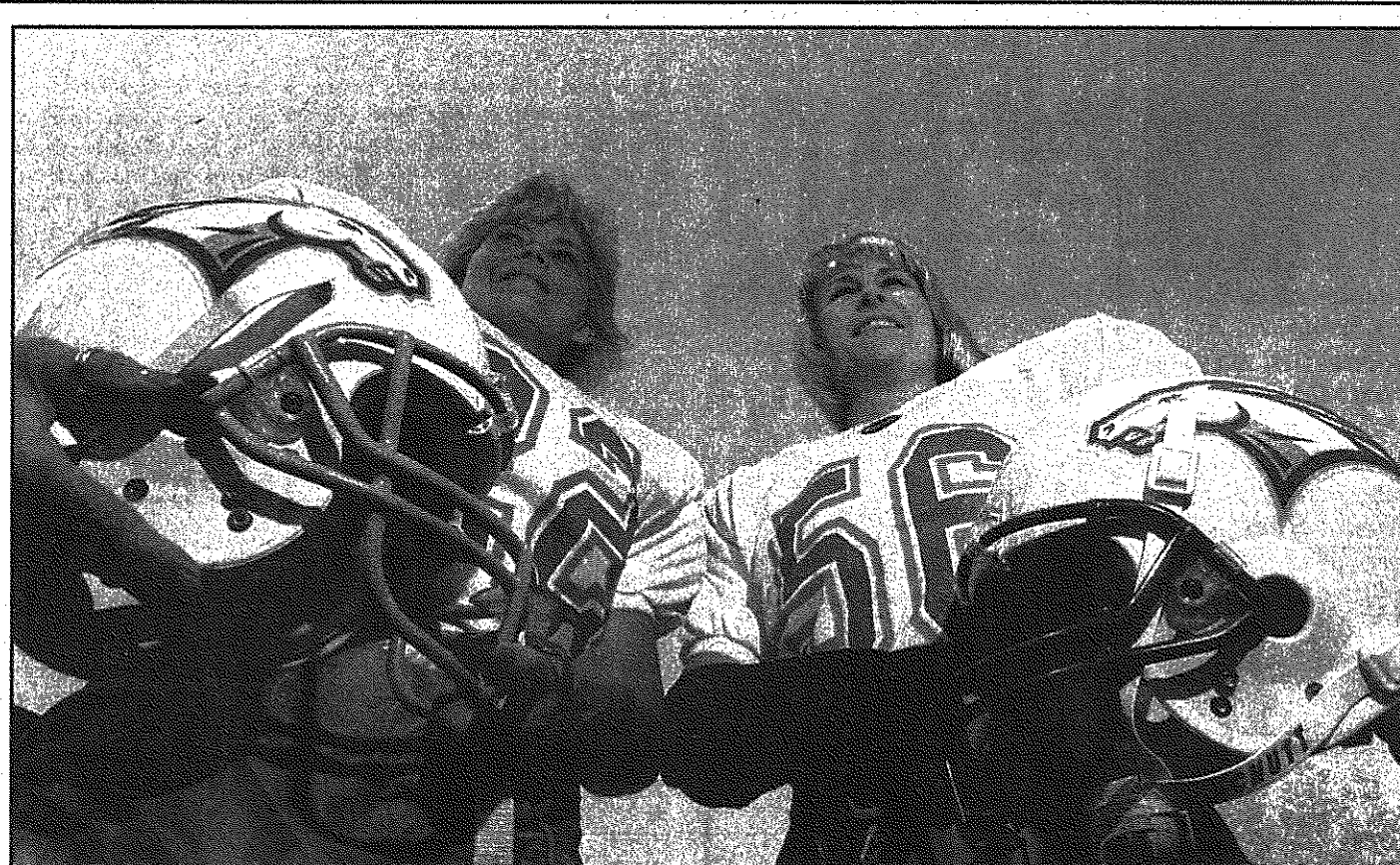

Canton women tackle life between the yard markers

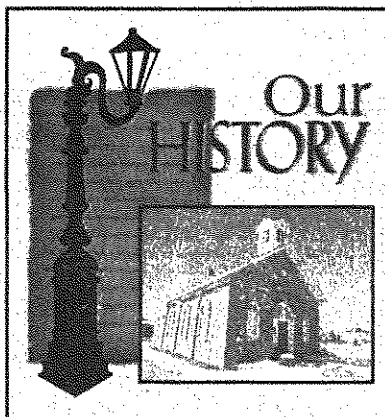
The idea of women playing full-contact professional football may seem odd to some, but the creation of the Detroit Danger has provided the opportunity of a lifetime for two Canton women.

"Actually, this is a dream come true for me," said Lisa Ryan, 36, who plays outside linebacker for the Danger.

The National Women's Football League is in its second year, with the Danger being a second season expansion team.

Ryan has had a lifetime love of football. "I've always enjoyed playing and watching football."

She tried to play on the football team in junior high, but was turned



down.

"I showed up with a group of girls and we were not given the opportunity to try out. It was treated like a joke," Ryan said.

The Dearborn Heights native also

plays on special teams, both on kick-off and punt returns.

But she has duties not shared by her male professional counterparts.

Ryan juggles professional football with her career as an in-patient psychiatric nurse at Sinai-Grace Hospital, marriage and motherhood to three young children.

"I have a great supportive husband, Bill, who picks up a lot of the slack," Ryan said, "He allows me to be me."

She said her employer has also been very flexible. "I can't get over how supportive everybody is."

Ahead of schedule

Ryan tried-out for the team in February. "I started training in January for tryouts next fall, but because

Plea goes out to bolster Canton Place fund

Helping Hands, a local fund that provides emergency aid for seniors, has found its bank account is getting slim.

The fund's founder, Ginnie Hauck, is hoping the generosity of local residents will bring the bank balance back to healthy levels.

Hauck is the director of Canton Place, a high-rise residence that houses

about 125 seniors on Sheldon Road.

"I started the Helping Hands Fund when I came to work here," she said. "I would notice people losing weight."

Hauck would check their apartments, ostensibly to check their shelving, and found that many of them were going without food in order to pay for their prescription medications.

"To have someone going hungry to pay for medication, or vice-versa, is an atrocity."

She said that most of her residents are living on fixed incomes.

"One of my residents was crying recently because her prescriptions were costing her \$200 a month," Hauck said.

She said that seniors are a very proud generation. "They may live with less than they actually need and think that it is OK."

The approaching summer also takes a toll on the Helping Hands Fund, as the units at Canton Place do not come

equipped with air conditioning.

"If someone does not have A/C because they can't afford it, it is not worth them having a heat stroke. I've had that happen," Hauck said.

She noted that one air conditioning unit will cost the fund \$500.

She said the fund is discretionary, and funds are dispensed anonymously to those in need.

Police nab 3 following hold-up and chase

A five-hour standoff that began Thursday following an armed robbery in Canton ended in Livonia when the last of three barricaded gunmen gave himself up early Friday morning.

The three men holed up inside Ideal Fabricating, a business on Schoolcraft Road after crashing their car into a utility pole during a police chase.

The men, all Detroit residents, ages 34, 30 and 28, were expected to be charged Saturday.

No one was injured in the incident, "which was pretty miraculous," Livonia Police Lt. Ben McDermott said.

The chase and ensuing siege unfolded after employees were herded into a closet at gunpoint in Valvoline Instant Oil Change on Ford Road in Canton

3 students caught passing fake cash

Three Discovery Middle School students are being investigated for attempting to pass a counterfeit \$20 bill in the cafeteria.

The incident on Monday, May 6, was almost two weeks after a similar incident resulted in five suspensions at Central Middle School.

Plymouth-Canton schools officials said in a release, "The money was used in the Discovery Middle School cafeteria and a student alerted the administration about the possibility of it being counterfeit. As soon as Discovery Middle School administrators were made aware of the possible counterfeit money, they contacted the parents of the students involved, then administrators contacted the Canton Township Police."

Canton police Det. Sgt. Todd Mutchler said the U.S. Secret

Service has been called in to investigate. However, because the incident involves juveniles, Canton police expect to complete the investigation and decide on any charges.

As a result of the investigation at Discovery, two students received five-day suspensions and the parents of one of the students has appealed the suspension to the Discovery Middle School Principal Roche LaVictor.

Mutchler also said his department "will investigate to see if there is any connection" with the counterfeit money confiscated at Central Middle School April 24.

In that investigation, Plymouth police said a 13-year-old boy was being investigated for taking \$100 in fake \$20 bills to school. The teen reportedly asked two students to exchange some of the money into smaller denominations. Police say several students came into possession of the fake bills, which were also used to pay for lunch in the school cafeteria.

Judy Evola, director of communications for Plymouth-Canton Schools, said five students were given suspensions ranging from 3-5 days.

The Central Middle School investigation also resulted in police questioning the teen's 16-year-old brother and their 18-year-old friend. All are from Canton. A computer was confiscated at the home of the oldest suspect.

Thus far, no criminal charges have been filed in either the Central or Discovery cases. Canton police are also investigating counterfeit money that was passed at the Sunoco gas station at Haggerty and Ford roads.

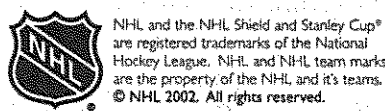

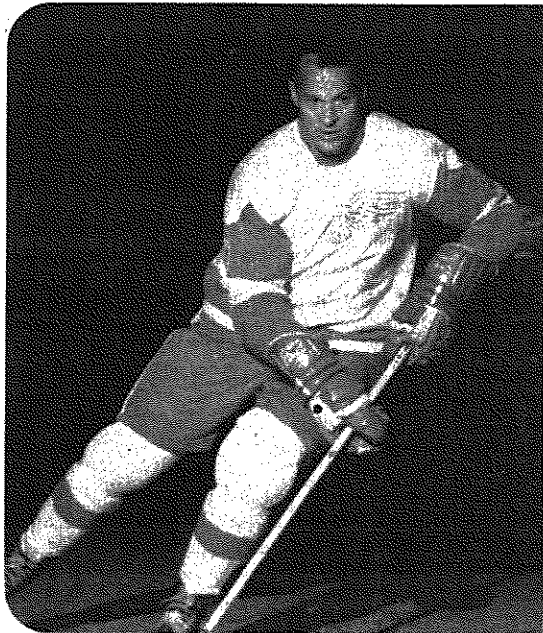

Ensuring a responsive district is forum focus

Wednesday night's forum for school board candidates went about how you'd expect what has been a calm, uneventful election season to go — with all the candidates stressing the importance of "doing it for the kids."

Ten of the 11 candidates took part in the forum sponsored by the League of Women Voters of Northwest Wayne County and the Observer Newspapers at the Canton Library. Eight of them are vying for two four-year seats; the other two are battling to win the year left on the unexpired term of former board member Steve Guile. The candidates spent nearly two hours in front of a crowded room answering questions on topics ranging from perceived communication problems to budget concerns.

The question that got the most agreement among the candidates concerned the idea that board members do not currently interact with audience members at meetings, except to take a "we'll get back to you position." It's been a stated concern of most of the candidates through the election season. The board's current policy is to take the question and "get back" to the person asking it; but some residents — and virtually all of the candidates — say the "getting back" part sometimes doesn't get done.

"I've been to meetings where no answers have come at all," said Joanne Lamar, one of the eight candidates for the four-year seats. "People get frustrated and they lose trust in the board."

Lamar drew the night's biggest laugh from the crowd when answering a question

about a potential policy switch that would make the board president the sole spokesperson when dealing with residents' questions. All 10 candidates said it was bad policy, that each board member should have the ability to interact with residents as they saw fit.

"I think we should all rely on the networks we have," Lamar said. "I'll tell you I get my best information in the aisles at Kroger."

"I'm not in favor of the position where the board president speaks for the board," said Mark Horvath, himself a former board president. "The board speaks for the board."

Most candidates agreed they were surprised to hear about impending layoffs of 18 teachers, although Bob Nelson pointed out a couple of times that it only equals about four full-time slots.

Most of the candidates spoke about the need to find different ways to drum up money, rather than focusing solely on cuts, to deal with the upcoming budget.

"The district is already running lean," said Richard Ham-Kucharski. "We need to look at alternative sources of revenue, not just at cutting."

The idea of turning the Talent and Gifted program into a home-school program rather than the current magnet concept was also a hot topic.

"Research shows the magnet TAG is the most effective," said Clifford Hill. "I wouldn't support a program that educates a small number of kids for a large cost."

Ham-Kucharski, Horvath, Lamar, Carol Saunders, Hill, Bill Pratt, Phil Sugg, Nelson and Sailesh Patel are running for the four-year terms. Debra Madonna and Marcy Staley, appointed to the board when Guile departed, are competing for the unexpired one-year term. The election is June 10.

around 7:45 p.m. Thursday.

According to Canton Police reports, the suspects stole an unspecified amount of cash from the oil change shop.

Police said the suspects drove into the facility in a white Chevy Malibu and asked for a new filter. Once inside, a passenger exited the rear of the vehicle carrying a handgun. A second passenger and the vehicle's driver then pulled out handguns as well.

Two employees were then forced at gunpoint into a lower-level storage area while a third was forced to destroy a security tape and then open the store's safe reports said.

Eventually, the suspects fled eastbound on Ford Road towards I-275, according to a witness.

Minutes later, Plymouth Township police spotted the Mal-

ibu and began pursuit of the suspects on I-275 near Ann Arbor Road. The pursuit continued into Livonia on eastbound I-96.

Shortly after 8 p.m., Livonia police spotted the white 1998 Chevy Malibu described as the getaway car going east on I-96 near Levan with Plymouth Township police and Wayne County sheriff patrol vehicles in pursuit.

The vehicle was traveling over 100 mph, police reports said.

Inside the manufacturing plant, one of the three surrendered shortly after talking to police by phone. Police tried to talk the others into giving up through a bullhorn, after they refused to answer the phone.

Livonia police SWAT team arrived and secured the building's perimeter. They went inside and arrested a second

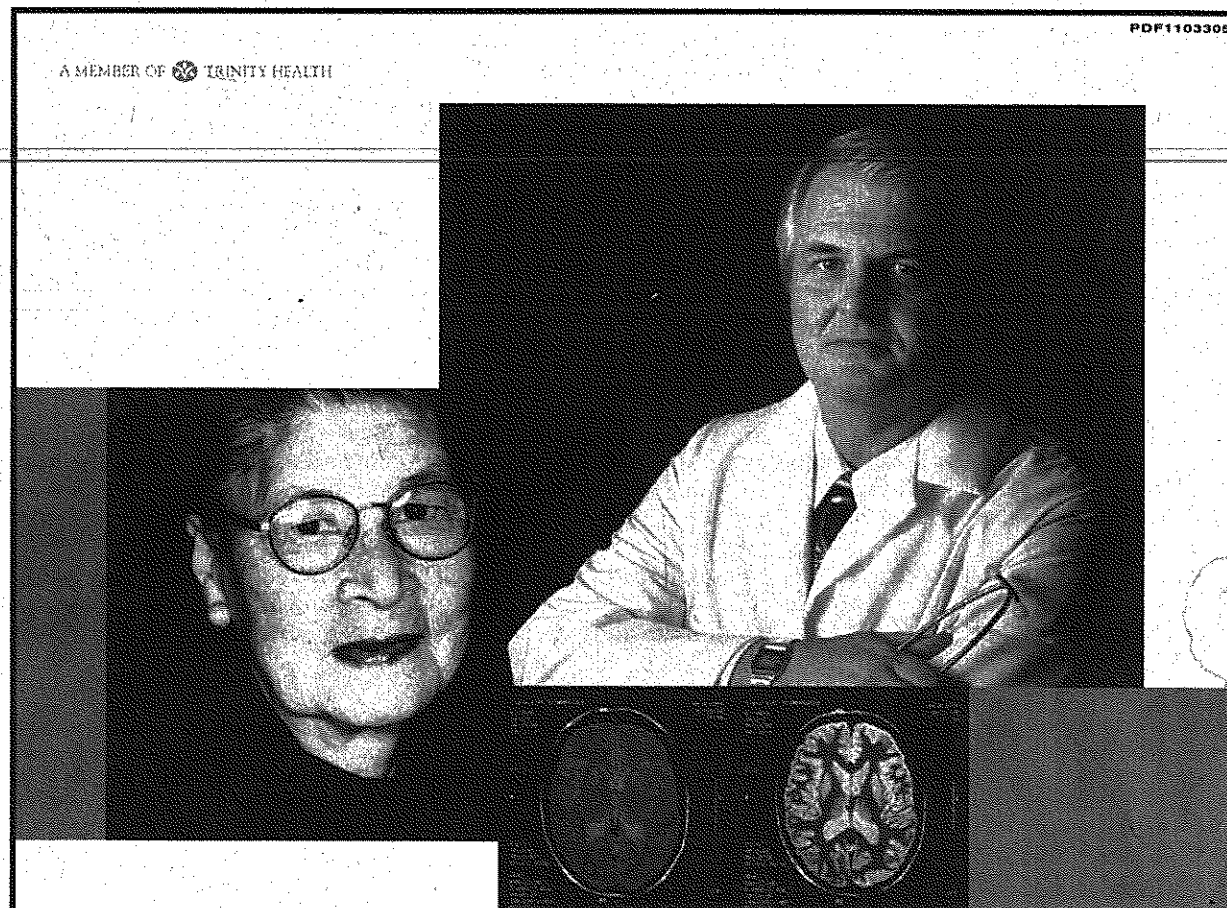
man, who was seen crawling on the floor.

After failed attempts to get the third man to come out, SWAT team members went inside the structure where they found the third man hiding underneath an elevated steel girder around 1:30 a.m.

"They had a good eye and found him there," McDermott said.

Authorities recovered one handgun in the car, which was totaled. A second gun was found in the Schoolcraft and Farmington road area. A third gun hasn't been recovered, but it's believed to be inside the Schoolcraft Road business.

On Friday, an employee reported finding a bag of money inside the bed of his truck, which was parked at the business during incident.

30 yards away from his bike as a
result of the impact, he said.
It is thought that the driver
panicked and fled the scene.
Kehrier hopes anyone with
knowledge of the accident will
feel a pang of conscience and
come forward with information.
Cowans was riding a bicycle
that winter night because his car
wouldn't start. His body and the
crumpled bicycle were found by
a passerby on Michigan Avenue,
just east of Beck, the next morn-
ing. Kehrier said statistically the
suspect vehicle was located in
1998 within a 20-mile radius of
the accident.
"We found a vehicle that had
all the right damage within 10
days of the accident, but it was
determined to have hit a deer."
Detective Tim Wright of the
Canton Police Department said
they are still actively involved in
trying to solve the case.
"We've just had no luck," he
said.
Wright said Canton Police
would welcome any information
from the public regarding the
case. Kehrier said Cowans was a
young man with a strong work
ethic and lots of ambition.
"He was a graduate of Eastern
Michigan University who

worked to put himself through
college."
Plymouth attorney Mike
Gerou offered a \$2,000 reward at
the time of the accident for infor-
mation leading to a solution of
the case. That offer still stands
today.
"I really hope this would have
been solved long ago," Gerou
said. "I know the family was
really torn up."
Gerou said many people would
have used a broken-down car as
an excuse to skip work altogeth-
er.
"To think that someone would
ride all the way (on a bicycle)
from Ypsilanti to Canton to go to
work."
He also believes that someone
has knowledge of the accident.
"I hope they will come forward."
Kehrier said he continues to
work the case without pay
because he is disturbed by the
details.
"Someone hit a human being
and left them like an animal to
die by the side of the road."



some of the girls didn't like the terms of their contract, the team had some openings."

"I had only two weeks to prepare." Yet, she made the cut.

She describes her attitude as "relentless."

The National Women's Football League plays by the same rules as the NFL with two exceptions. "We play with a smaller football, and can complete a pass with only one foot in bounds."

She likes playing defense. "I enjoy tackling - it's a lot fun."

Ryan admits the game has been hard on her body. "It takes quite a toll. I've had four broken fingers, jammed fingers and a knee injury."

She stands 5-feet-7-inches and weighs 146 pounds. "I'm not big, but I'm tough."

Her Canton teammate, Bev McManus, 39, is equally determined.

She attributes her presence on the Danger to "a lot of hard work and sweat. It was very time consuming."

The married mother of three also operates a home-based business, In-Home Executive Services. She also gives credit to her husband Jim. "I couldn't do this without him."

McManus tired-out for the team with 225 other women. "To make it was quite an accomplishment."

She plays running back for the Danger, or did until a helmet to the knee placed her on the injured reserve list.

McManus has surgery to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in her knee last Friday. "I was just devastated that it required surgery." The injury will cause her to miss the rest of the Danger's season.

McManus dreamed of playing professional basketball, but sadly, women's professional basketball did not exist at that time, she said.

She played varsity basketball for four years while in high school.

Even surgery to remove a benign tumor from her skull could not keep her off the basketball court.

I have my surgery in July and played my first game in October," she said. "I had to play with protective head gear my whole senior year."

It was a full four years before her skull had healed sufficiently

for her to play sports without head protection.

McManus said, "The moral of that story is the you can do anything you put your mind to."

She is determined to make a comeback from her knee surgery too. "You know, I'm going to beat the odds."

Mixed reactions

Ryan said her involvement with the Detroit Danger team has met with mixed reaction from other women.

"I talk to some women who know and are excited about it, and others who don't have a clue."

Ryan said the women playing in the NWFL range in age from 18 to 58, with 21 teams in the league.

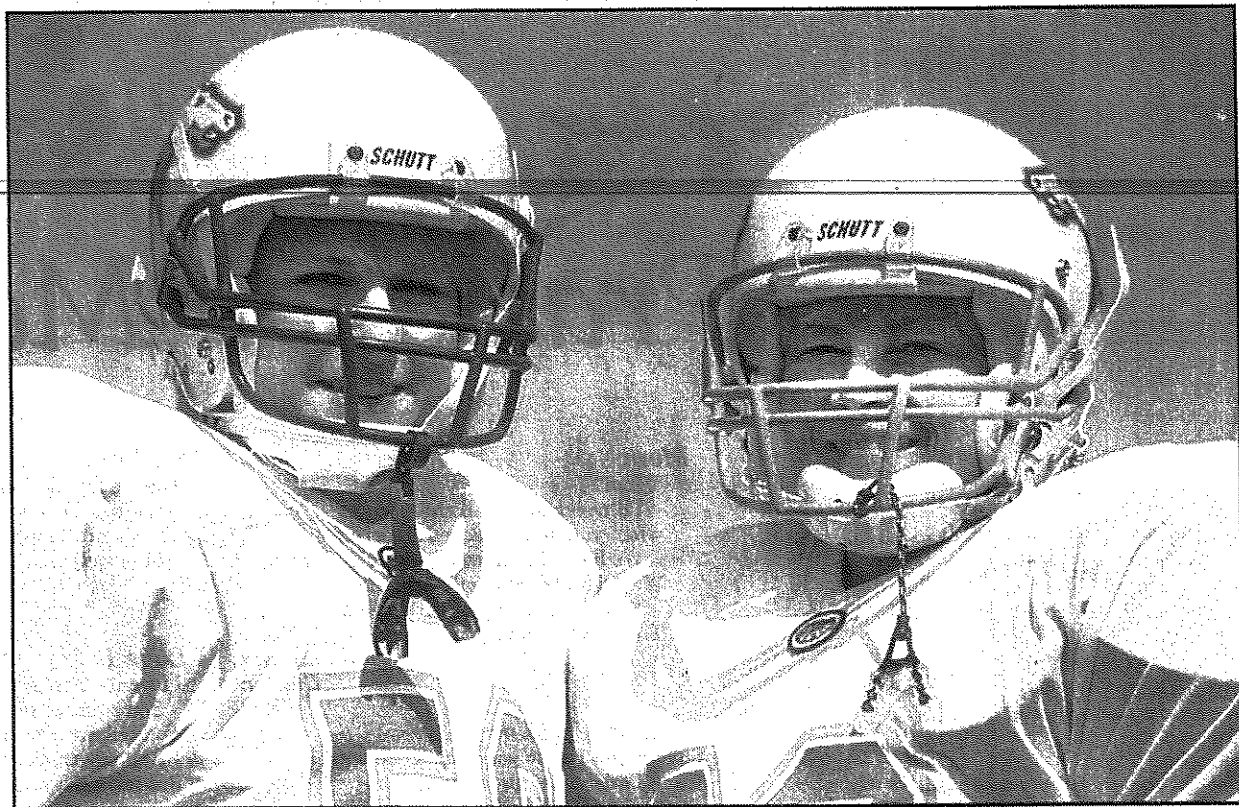
"It's so exciting to be on a team," Ryan said. She said she is reminded of the movie, *A League of Their Own*, about women's professional baseball during World War II.

She hopes there will be a time when women can actually make a living playing professional football. Currently, players receive a small stipend at the end of the season.

"The wages aren't that great," Ryan said. "It's nothing that you can make a living at, but there is hope."

"I just want everyone to know that this league is out there, and to come watch us play," McManus said. "You will be absolutely amazed. It's at a level that is incomprehensible."

Board OKs research park land sale

Canton Township Trustees have approved the sale of a 4.48-acre parcel of land on Haggerty Road between Palmer and Michigan Avenue for just over \$536,000.

The land is zoned for research park use and township finance director Tony Minghine said the developer who approached the

township had a "project that makes sense and would be consistent with research park use."

He said he understood it would be a high tech manufacturing facility.

J. Bennett Donaldson, president of J. B. Donaldson Co. which has made the offer, would say only that the project would be consistent with the zoning.

Proceeds from the sale will go into the township's public improvement fund.

The land is part of a 19-acre parcel that the township owns between Haggerty and I-275. Minghine said at one time the Donaldson Company had an offer to buy the whole 19 acres, but that project never developed.

"He came back with this offer and it seemed to make sense to us," he said.

Minghine said the 4.48-acre parcel is odd shaped and has no frontage on Haggerty.

"He's getting the frontage from

somebody else," he said, "and the rest of the property retained by the township does have frontage."

Donaldson said he could discuss details of the project for probably another 30 days.

Minghine said typically is such transactions the proposed buyer has 90 days to check out the parcel, do surveys, etc. He said closing would probably take place within three to four months.

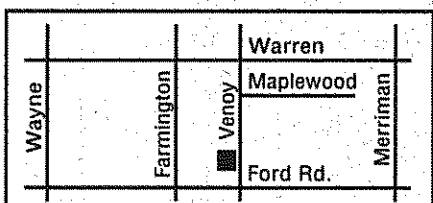

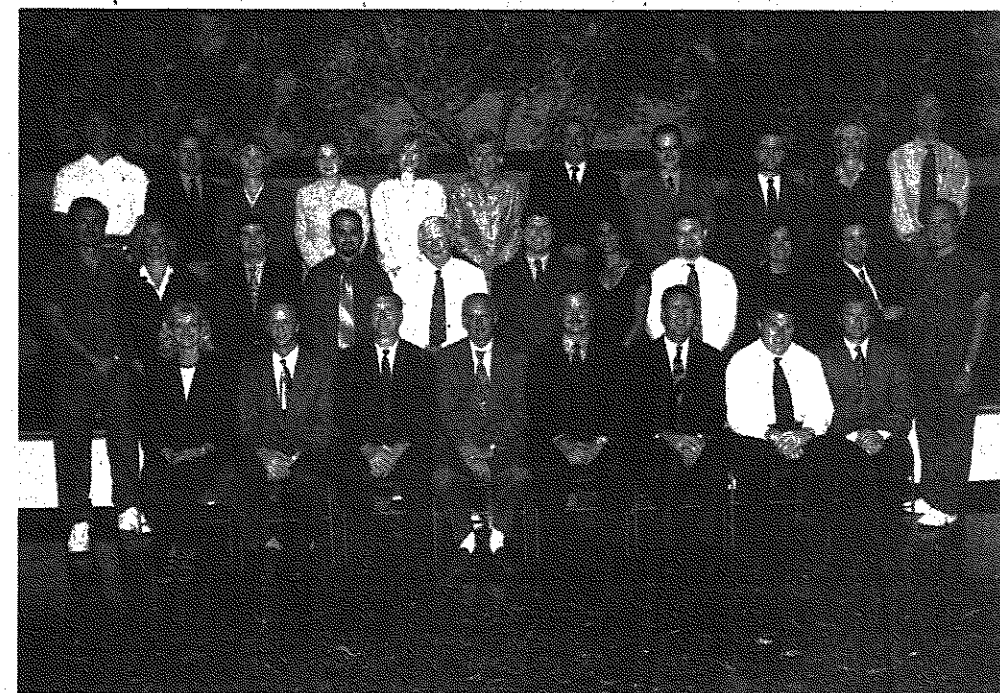

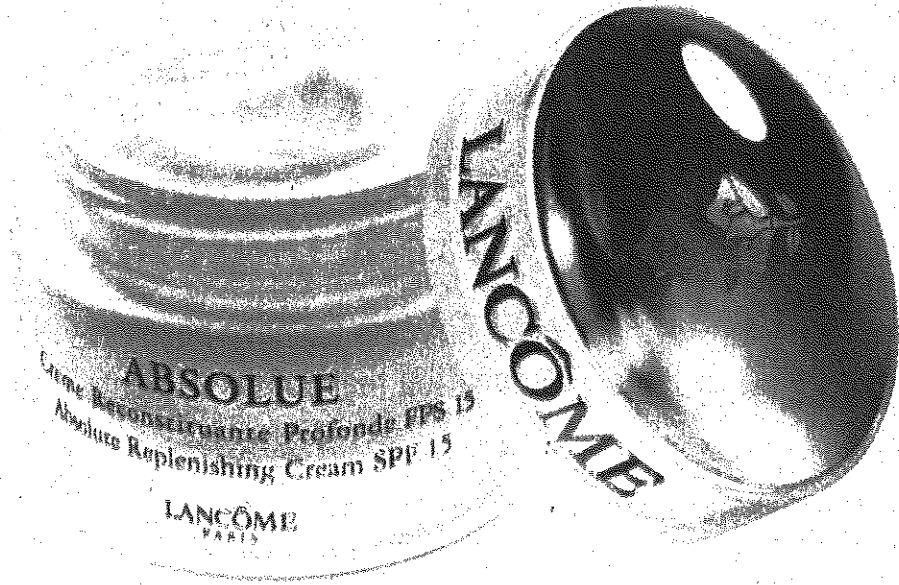

Chilean wine
quality improves

Santiago, Chile — There's a psychology to importing foreign wines to the United States. The French got it right. When they began shipping wines to the U.S., they sent their best.

The first Italian wines to appear in the U.S. were cheap chiantis in straw baskets. They weren't very good and Americans got the impression that all Italian wines were light, thin and cheap. That has all changed now, but it took a long time to erase first impressions.

Until now, most Chilean wine imported to the U.S. has been under \$10 and of only average quality. Thankfully, that is changing rapidly. Popularly-priced wines are improving and new wines from Chile are raising the quality bar.

With a coast line of about 2,700 miles, Chile occupies much of the west coast of South America. Wine growing areas are north-south valleys near Santiago. They are bordered on the east by the Andes Mountain range and on the west by the Pacific Ocean.

SANTA RITA estate is located in the heart of the Maipo Valley, 25 miles south of Santiago. The winery is surrounded by more than 1,700 acres of vineyards. The valley floor and surrounding foothills are planted to cabernet sauvignon, merlot and carmenere (an ancient Bordeaux variety that was once misidentified as merlot). Santa Rita has chardonnay and sauvignon blanc planted in the Casablanca Valley, which runs east-west near the coast. The climate is cooler than Maipo and perfect for these and other white varieties.

The 2001 Santa Rita Reserve Sauvignon Blanc \$13 boasts bright grapefruit and fresh, crisp flavors. Both the 2001 Reserve Chardonnay \$13 and Medalla Real Chardonnay \$15 are very good. As a group the Santa Rita red wines offer a big mouthful with solid structure. The highlight is the Casa Real Cabernet Sauvignon \$65 with an attractive coffee aroma and structure for the long haul.

CALITERA is a partnership of two families, Robert Mondavi of Napa Valley and Eduardo Chadwick of Chile's Vina Errazuriz. Grapes for the wines are sourced from many Chilean growing regions under long term contracts. The vineyards are overseen by a team of viticulturists to ensure fruit quality.

The wines are widely available for \$8-10 and often represent best buys among our Wine Picks.

CASA LAPOSTOLLE is the pride of France's Marnier-Lapostolle family. After researching for several years, Alexandra Marnier-Lapostolle, chose a vineyard site and built a winery in the Rapel Valley, about 100 miles south of Santiago. The best wines of Casa Lapostolle are labeled Cuvee Alexandre Cabernet Sauvignon \$22 and Merlot \$25. Clos Apalta \$60 is an outstanding blend of merlot, cabernet sauvignon, carmenere and malbec.

ERRAZURIZ is located in the Aconcagua Valley, incredibly beautiful and especially suited to growing quality red wines. With multiple soil types, each variety is planted in a site where unique characteristics favor develop-

Far East delight

Asian Pacific month celebrates flavorful heritage

Many countries make up the Asian Pacific region — and many styles of dining too. Today and next Sunday, the Taste section examines cuisines of the region in honor of Asian Pacific American Heritage Month in May. Korean, Filipino, and Vietnamese cuisines are highlighted today. Northern and southern Indian cuisines, plus Chinese and Japanese meal information, will be featured next week.

Nearly 275,000 Asian Americans live in the metro Detroit area, The U.S. Census Bureau reports. As its population continues to grow, so does the number of Asian Pacific restaurants that pop up in neighborhoods throughout Wayne and Oakland County.

Chinese foods have been embraced in the Midwest since the early 1970s. As the palates of Americans yearn for more exotic foods, the acceptance of Japanese, Korean, Filipino, Vietnamese and Indian foods has followed.

The positive impacts Asian Pacific Americans have made in America — from food to culture to economic contributions — is being recognized Saturday, May 18 at *Splendor of the East* at Southfield's Millennium Center. Music and dance is the highlight and guests are also invited to a gourmet reception before the event.

Sponsored by metro-Detroit's Council of Asian Pacific Americans, *Splendor of the East* is just one

event in honor of Asian Pacific Heritage Month. It's a month that Asian Pacific Americans take seriously, said James Snider of CAPA — who is half Korean from his mother's side of the family.

"We don't want to see our culture dissipate," Snider, of Farmington Hills, said. "Our culture is rich in tradition — and we want to share those traditions."

One way to share those traditions is through food — the age-old adage, of course, is that food can be used as a tool to bring others together.

The event for VIPS, sponsors and artists begins at 6 p.m. Ticket prices range from \$10-\$15 per person and includes cuisine from local restaurateurs including:

■ Woo Lee Gardens in Southfield, which features Korean and Japanese dining

■ Shangri-La in West Bloomfield, which features Chinese seafood

■ Rushi in Southfield, which features Indian dining

■ Red Ribbon in Madison Heights, which features Filipino food

Asian Pacific American food is lower in fat and cholesterol than most Western foods. What's the difference between all the style of Asian Pacific foods? Here's a condensed breakdown:

■ Korean and Japanese have the most similarities between the countries, Snider

explained. Both use simple ingredients yet pay close attention to detail — especially aesthetics. Think sushi for Japanese. Hot rice and vegetables for Korean.

Korean food uses more spice than Japanese cuisine. Korean food is hot, especially in temperature. Ceramic hot pots literally keep meals steaming for 60 minutes.

"A little onion, a little piece of fish and it's amazing what can be created," he said.

■ Filipino cuisine incorporates many different cultural influences, including Spanish. Mild spices. Egg rolls. Lots of fruit and especially mango. Think Pan Sit with small noodles and

CUCUMBER VEGETABLE SALAD (KOREAN OL NAMUL)

3 cucumbers
1 tablespoon salt
1 clove garlic
¼ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon sesame seeds
1 teaspoon sesame oil
¼ teaspoon cayenne pepper
1 teaspoon sugar

This simple cucumber salad is a pleasant accompaniment to a hot summer night. Small cucumbers are suggested; they are not quite as watery as the large ones nor do they require peeling.

Slice the cucumbers in circles. Sprinkle salt over the cucumber slices, mix well and let them stand for 30 minutes. Place the cucumbers in a damp cloth and gently but firmly squeeze out as much water as possible. The less watery the cucumbers, the better tasting the dish.

Crush the garlic, then combine it with the cucumbers, salt, sesame seeds, sesame oil, pepper and sugar in a bowl. Mix well.

Put a rainbow on your plate

If we could make one wish under the rainbow, many of us would wish for good health to live our life. The best way to stay healthy remains the same — eat a variety of foods from all five-food groups, and get regular exercise.

Colorful foods have caught our eye since the beginning of time. We are drawn to beautiful, luscious foods. Go to the produce section of any grocery store to see it bursting with colors. These foods contain powerful phytochemicals to protect against illness and disease. Phytochemicals are from plant compounds and researchers theorize that they help sop up free radicals that attack and weaken healthy cells

making you more susceptible to cancer and other diseases. A diet rich in fruits and vegetables provides up to 25,000 different phytochemicals. No single phytochemical in a fruit or vegetable will be a panacea for cancer prevention. Choose a variety of different colored fruits and vegetables for diversity in phytochemicals.

Eileen Dobrotka of Farmington does a color tour of the grocery store. "I look for colorful foods because they have the highest levels of cancer-fighting chemicals." Her family likes stir-fried vegetables like peppers, onions and zucchini. "This dish takes a little longer to prepare, but then I throw in some chicken, serve it with bread, and it is a full meal."

Load your plate with color by choosing a plant-based diet. At least two-thirds of your plate should be from the fruit, vegetable or grain groups. Tamera Christie-Glynn of Farmington eats only a vegetarian diet. "I like to use different cooking techniques with vegetables. Being a vegetarian, I can be a little more liberal with cooking oils since I'm not eating all that animal fat."

Choosing colorful food is not the same thing as buying purple ketchup or blue margarine. Children love these funky colored foods, but they don't contain phytochemicals, only food coloring agents. There is no magic bullet

Rainbow of Benefits

Colors: Deep reds and blues
Foods: Blueberries, strawberries, raspberries, blackberries, currants

SPRING SALAD A LA JARDINIERE

Red skin potatoes, small, 2 1/4 pounds
Lima or butter beans, canned, drained, 1 1/3 pounds
Cherry tomatoes, halved, 1 1/2 cups
White wine vinegar, 1/4 cup
Dry mustard, 1 tablespoon, 1 1/2 teaspoon
Olive oil, 1/3 cup
Salt, 1 1/2 teaspoon
Black pepper, 3/4 teaspoon
Asparagus, fresh, 1 pound
Green onion, 3/4 pound
Walnuts, pieces, toasted, 1/3 cup

Fill sauce pan with water to cover potatoes, add dash of salt and bring to a boil. Cook for 10-12 minutes until tender. Drop in the asparagus and blanch for 3 minutes. Drain the asparagus and potatoes. Rinse both in icy water and set aside. In a separate bowl mix the white wine vinegar, dry mustard, olive oil, salt and pepper to make a dressing. Set aside. In a separate bowl, combine the drained lima or butter beans with cherry tomatoes. Slice the cooked potatoes into the beans. Add the

blanched asparagus, cut green onion and toss gently. Pour the dressing over the vegetables and toss gently with toasted walnuts. Serve with fresh, hot bread. Makes 6 - 2 cup servings.

Tomato paste, 1/8 cup

chicken. "Americans still are not widely familiar with Filipino food yet," Snider said.

"Chinese is the food that most Americans are familiar with," Snider said.

Still, there's different types — Mongolian, Cantonese, etc.

Authentic Chinese foods use sesame oil, but Americans demand heavier flavor so peanut oil is also used at restaurants in the U.S. Seafood is popular in

Chinese foods, in American foods, more beef is used to satisfy western palates. Think Gai Kow or Lo Mein.

And then there's Indian food. Exotic spices, complicated combinations. Peas, potatoes, cheese, curries, lentils and — spice.

"Indian foods are bombarded wonderfully with flavor," Snider said. "It's spicy hot."

CUCUMBER VEGETABLE SALAD (KOREAN OL NAMUL)

3 cucumbers
1 tablespoon salt
1 clove garlic
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon sesame seeds
1 teaspoon sesame oil
1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
1 teaspoon sugar

This simple cucumber salad is a pleasant accompaniment to a hot summer night. Small cucumbers are suggested; they are not quite as watery as the large ones nor do they require peeling.

Slice the cucumbers in circles. Sprinkle salt over the cucumber slices, mix well and let them stand for 30 minutes. Place the cucumbers in a damp cloth and gently but firmly squeeze out as much water as possible. The less watery the cucumbers, the better tasting the dish.

Crush the garlic, then combine it with the cucumbers, salt, sesame seeds, sesame oil, pepper and sugar in a bowl. Mix well.

KOREAN BBQ TOFU

1/2 cup soy sauce
5 teaspoons sugar or sweetener
2 teaspoons dry mustard
4 cloves garlic or 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
2 teaspoons onion powder
a little water
1 lb. extra firm tofu, frozen for 24-48 hours and then thawed naturally. (Editor's note: Freezing tofu helps improve its texture from slippery to dense).

Cut tofu in strips 1/2 inch thick and marinate, then fry and garnish with vegetables of your choice. I like to cut tofu in squares and throw in a vegetable stir-fry.

SHRIMP BALLS IN VEGETABLE SAUCE VIETNAMESE

6 tablespoons oil
1 each thinly sliced onion

1 cup coarsely shredded cabbage
1 cup diced celery
1 cup bean sprouts
2 cups beef or vegetable broth
1 tablespoon soy sauce
1/4 teaspoon dried ground chili peppers
1 pound cooked shrimp, peeled and deveined
1 slice white bread
1/4 cup milk
1 cup mashed potatoes
1/4 pound beef, ground
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1/2 teaspoons freshly ground black pepper
1 egg

Heat 3 tablespoons oil in a saucepan; sauté the onion 5 minutes. Add the cabbage, celery, and bean sprouts. Sauté 3 minutes. Add the broth, soy sauce, and chili peppers; cook over low heat 15 minutes. Prepare the shrimp and meat balls while the vegetables are cooking. Chop the shrimp, reserving 6. Soak the bread in the milk and mash. Mix with the potatoes, beef, chopped shrimp, salt, pepper, and egg.

Shape into 1 inch balls. Heat remaining oil in a skillet. Brown the balls in it. Add to the vegetables with the reserved shrimp cut in half. Cook over low heat 5 minutes.

Standards provide for kinder treatment of farm animals

(AScribe Newswire) -- From the fast food restaurants of American's suburbs to the four-star dining experiences in New York City, there's a whole new meaning to the term "happy meal."

On May 9, America's leading chefs and environmentalists endorsed the Animal Welfare Institute's standards for the humane treatment of pigs and the support of independent family farms.

Waterkeeper Alliance President Robert F. Kennedy Jr., along with leaders from Slow Food USA, the Chefs Collaborative, Earth Pledge Foundation, and the Global Resource Action Center for the Environment announced they endorse AWI's Humane On-Farm Pig Husbandry Standards. Diane Halverson, Farm Animal Advisor of the Animal Welfare Institute, outlined the organization's standards and showed footage of farms meeting these standards.

"We are seeking to revitalize a culture of humane, independent family farm husbandry," said Halverson. "Our husbandry protocol enables farmers to raise pigs without the routine use of low levels of antibiotics; these humane farmers are protecting the effectiveness of antibiotics in human and veterinary medicine."

The Animal Welfare Institute created Humane On-Farm Pig Husbandry Standards in response to the explosion of large-scale crowded animal factories across the U.S. AWI criteria require that animals be allowed to behave naturally, recommend pasture raising of pigs, demand ample space and bedding for the animals and the opportunity for sows to build nests. They forbid the use of crates which prohibit animals from walking or turning and other cruel practices that have become commonplace on factory farms.

Cookbooks reflect motherly inspiration

(AP) -- A new cookbook, *Lumiere* (Ten Speed Press, \$35), is named for the Vancouver, British Columbia, restaurant of its author, Rob Feenie. It's an elegant publication with a wide selection of stylish recipes carefully set out, and illustrated with color photos.

Before he established his own successful restaurant in 1995, Feenie worked in the United States with several renowned chefs, including Charlie Trotter, Daniel Boulud and Jean-Georges Vongerichten.

Going back to even earlier influences, Feenie dedicates his book to his parents, Laurie and Margaret Feenie, and includes some recipes that derive from his mother's.

WALNUT CAKE WITH MAPLE ICE CREAM

For the ice cream:
1 cup heavy cream
1 cup whole milk
5 large egg yolks
1/3 cup sugar
1/3 cup maple syrup

For the cake:
1 1/2 cups of flour

1 teaspoon baking powder
3/4 cup maple syrup
Juice of 1 lemon
3/4 pound unsalted butter, room temperature (11/2 cups)
1 1/4 cup sugar
Pulp of 1/2 vanilla bean
7 large eggs
1 cup walnut pieces, toasted, ground

To prepare ice cream:

In a saucepan over medium-high heat, bring cream and milk almost to boiling point. In a bowl, whisk yolks and sugar to the ribbon stage. Add maple syrup. Temper the yolk mixture with some of the cream and milk. Finish whisking in remaining cream and milk. Place mixture in a double boiler over simmering water and stir constantly until it reaches 175 F or it coats the back of a spoon. Cool and strain. Freeze in an ice cream maker according to instructions. (The ice cream will be more velvety if the mixture is refrigerated overnight.)

To make the walnut cake:

Line terrine molds or loaf pans with parchment and grease with butter and dust with flour. Pre-

heat oven to 325 F. Sift together flour and baking powder and set aside. Combine maple syrup and lemon juice and set aside. With an electric mixer, cream together butter, sugar and vanilla pulp. Add one egg at a time to the butter mixture until well blended. Add half of the flour mixture and beat to incorporate. Beat in half of maple syrup mixture. Repeat, beating in flour then maple syrup mixture. Scrape down the bowl.

Add ground walnuts; mix until just combined. Pour batter into prepared pans. Bake for 45 to 60 minutes, or until a knife inserted in the middle comes out clean.

Makes 8 servings.

There is also plenty of technical food lore, information and tips woven into the recipes' presentation. Recipes, which total about 125, include many which, although they sound and taste rather exotic, are perfectly easy for the American home cook to make.

Power winders 'tell a story'

FOCUS ON PHOTOGRAPHY

Many of the newer, automatic cameras come with built-in winders that advance the film automatically after each shot.

Film advance devices are also available as add-on accessories for more advanced 35mm cameras and can be a valuable addition to your camera gear.

Called power winders and motor drives and frequently used by sports photographers and photo-journalists, they can benefit you, too.

Film advance devices enable you to concentrate all your attention on your subject instead of being distracted momentarily to advance the film. After all, things sometimes happen so fast that you may miss the important

moment. Winders and motor drives will give you a better chance to catch the action at its peak whether it's the instant the bat strikes the ball or the second the diver enters the water.

Power winders can help in taking candid and portraits, too. When you don't have to remove your eye from the viewfinder for a series of shots, you're more likely to capture those unguarded moments when expressions will be more natural and spontaneous.

Even exhibiting a series of pictures in sequence that "tell a story" can be an exciting new way to display your shots.

Winders and motor drives easily attach to the underside of your camera and are powered by a set of batteries. Some cameras have both winders and drivers available as accessories. What are the differences?

Threefold...speed, cost and stability. Winders operate at a speed of one or two frames per

second, where some motor drives can crank out a roll of 36m shots in under four seconds without the photographer having to remove his finger from the shutter release! Because of this high rate of speed, motor drives are more complex, ruggedly built, and therefore, more costly. Most often, the less expensive power winders are adequate for the amateur's needs.

A word of caution. Winders and drivers can be seductive and you'll find it tempting to shoot frame after frame indiscriminately listening to the pleasant "Whirr" of the film advancing. So try to concentrate hard on your subject and compose carefully. Thoughtful use of a power winder will reward you with many exciting pictures.

Kraus joined the show in January and is having a great time. Performing at Radio City Music Hall was a remarkable experience.

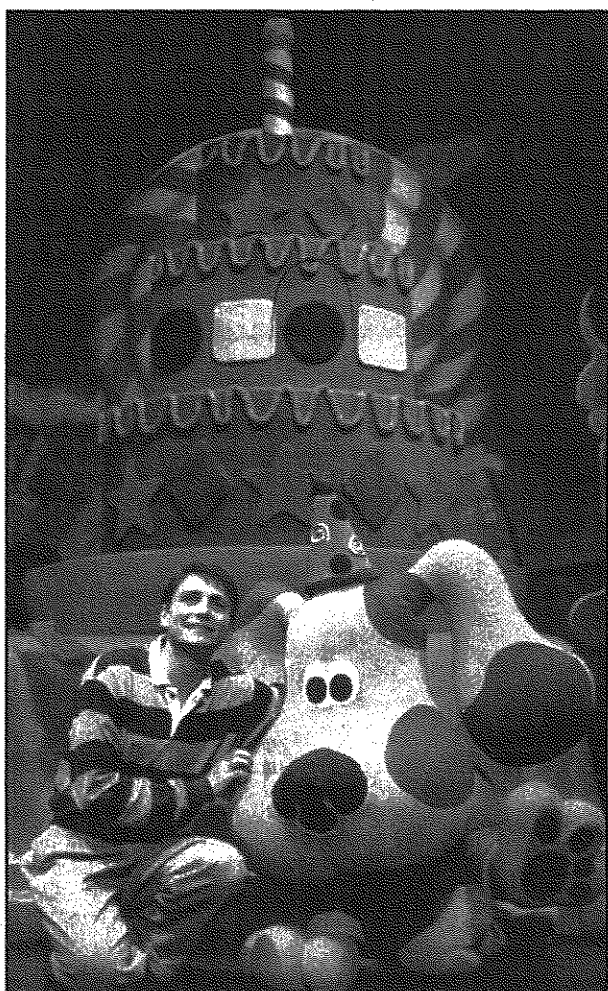
"It blew my mind," he said. "It seats almost 6,000 people, and is one of the clearest, most lovely places I've ever performed at."

Yiddish books are poised for comeback

AMHERST, Massachusetts (AP) — They were rescued from trash bins, attics and basements crumbling books written in Yiddish, a language with a future as flimsy as the volumes themselves.

Now the pages of 12,000 Yiddish books have been digitally preserved and many titles that haven't been published in more than 50 years are expected to be available online.

The project is a culmination of four years of work for the National Yiddish Book Center. And it's a crowning achievement for its founder, Aaron Lansky, who has directed a 22-year mission to salvage 1.5 million Yiddish books.

"Could you imagine if in all the bookstores and libraries in the world, there were only three copies of 'Moby Dick' left?" Lansky said. "That's the situation we were facing."

Yiddish, a Germanic language written in Hebrew, was spoken by about 11 million Jews in

Eastern Europe, North America and elsewhere. As Jews immigrated to America after the Holocaust, some Yiddish words such as "schmooze" and "klutz" assimilated with English, but future generations largely lost interest in the language.

The books Lansky collected are mostly duplicates of some 15,000 titles. They've been stored at the center's home at the Hampshire College campus and sold to institutions and scholars trying to bolster their Yiddish libraries.

About five years ago, Lansky and his colleagues realized they were getting down to their final few copies of some of titles. The center soon began digitizing each title in its collection.

At a warehouse in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania, workers severed the spines of 12,000 works of poems, plays and stories and scanned each of their pages into a computer system.

"We had to destroy the books in order to save them forever," said Nancy Sherman, the center's vice president. "We've realized that our mission wasn't just about collecting books. It's about

preserving them."

It took four years to get the 12,000 titles scanned and onto a Web site, where people can scroll through the list of titles and buy one online.

About 3,000 more books — the center's most fragile — still need to be scanned.

Within minutes of receiving an order, a printer in Mechanicsburg will spit out an entire book, now printed on paper estimated to last about 500 years. Each book will cost \$29, or \$21.75 for members of the National Yiddish Book Center.

Now that the books have been preserved, Lansky and other Yiddish scholars say their focus needs to be on making sure there will be people who are able to read them.

"At least we now know there will always be a supply of Yiddish books," said Jeremy Dauber, a professor of Yiddish literature at Columbia University. "Now we need to make sure there's a demand."

Number of books up, sales down

NEW YORK (AP) — The latest numbers from the publishing world: More books are being released, but fewer will likely be bought.

The Book Industry Study Group, a nonprofit research organization, said Friday that the number of books purchased this year was expected to drop from 2.41 billion in 2001 to 2.39 billion in 2002. The study group anticipates a decline of another 10 million next year.

"Until we see a serious decline

in the unemployment rate, until there are other indicators that show us the economy is really going to move ... we're a bit pessimistic," said Albert Greco, a statistician for the study group.

Friday's news continues a trend of slow sales even as the number of books increase. A report earlier this week from the publishing data firm R.R. Bowker estimated that 135,000 new books came out in the United States last year, more than 10 percent over 2000.

Greco said the economy is not the only culprit for the industry's recent troubles; the children's

market has been hurt by the absence of a new Harry Potter work, with sales projected to drop from 403 million books last year to 360 million in 2003.

"Juvenile books have traditionally been a roller coaster business," Greco said. "Here we can see the impact of one author and one book series on an entire segment of the industry."

The Book Industry Study Group made its presentation at BookExpo America, the publishing industry's annual national convention.

Disney's Animal Kingdom will give you a happy face

I love Walt Disney World. Sure, I once hated it. I pictured it as little more than an overrated roadside carnival with drunken teenagers running around in rat suits.

The cure for hating Disney is about the same as the cure for hating cats. Once you have your own cat, you realize how cool they can be.

Every year, I attend a veterinary conference held in January in Orlando. The first year, we went to Epcot, one of the four main parks within the massive Disney complex, mostly to make fun of it. By the end of the day I found myself wearing an oversized Mad Hatter's hat, ooh-ing and ah-ing at fireworks, grinning ear to ear. A great place, almost an alternative universe, that really does seem to be the happiest place on earth.

Rarely can traveling to Orlando be called inexpensive. Prices like a \$15 breakfast buffet can make your mouth drop open. Disney makes up for these prices by exceeding expectations, attending to every detail, and giving the opportunity to just about everyone to have a great day no matter which of the four theme parks they are visiting.

Especially when they are visiting The Animal Kingdom.

The Animal Kingdom can be described as a zoo that has been Disney-ed. After entering and pushing through crowds of kids waiting to take their picture with Baloo, or Tigger, or some character from Mulan that I've never heard of, you enter an area that feels like a rain forest, with an oasis of birds and tropical critters. Walking further, more animal exhibits surround the Tree of Life, the huge, artificial tree that serves as the park's centerpiece, with multitudes of animal images carved into the bark.

A short walk, and you find yourself in an African Village, listening to native music, then riding a jeep through a safari, or walking a trail where naturalists stationed by exhibits tell you about the animals, from hippos to mountain gorillas.

Trains made to look like they traverse African plains take you to the petting zoo, and the veterinary area, with windows giving you views into the actual vet clinic, such as the shell surgery on a tortoise we saw.

A short walk takes you to Asia, where animals like tigers and bats are on display in excellent habitats, again with naturalists from the nations the animals are native to answering questions about them. This adds even more to the illusion the park creates through architecture and

Room with a view: If making reservations, make sure you ask for a room overlooking the savanna, as some overlook the pool area.

Money saving food tips: The Lodge snack bar sells large cups for about \$10 to be reused for soft drinks throughout your stay. Given the cost of individual soft drinks, it's a great investment.

Transportation: A great bus/monorail system is included with the stay. Getting to and from the four Disneyworld theme parks from the lodge couldn't be easier.

music of being in another country.

Oh, sure, you have to have the theme park touches. Water rides, gift shops, musical and 3-D shows all dot the park. But most impressive are the smiles on the guests' faces. Kids aren't bored thinking it's too educational. Adults aren't wishing for a fifth of Scotch to try to get that "Small World" song out of their head like the Magic Kingdom. How could it get better?

How about if you could stay there?

The Animal Kingdom Lodge, Disneyworld's brand spanking new resort, opened last year next to the Animal Kingdom. We had heard about the facility when it was being built, and called several months in advance for reservations. Since both my wife and I are veterinarians, when we get time off we make sure we get away from it all...by looking at more critters!

Nice amenities can be found here: Good food (including a wonderful African buffet, Boma, which features American and African dishes), great rooms (done to look like an African lodge), attention to detail and hospitality. But the animals make the experience great.

Three large savannas, African style fields populated by animals native to the continent, surround and are surrounded by the hotel. Almost every room has a balcony overlooking a savanna.

The animals have free run of the area, and move around quietly, living a relatively normal existence. Some mornings, look out your balcony, and there's a giraffe, an impala, and some wildebeest. After breakfast, you look again, there's a bongo, a Thompson's gazelle, maybe a

blue crane. It's so entertaining that the ride to a park to see Mickey or Donald might be put on hold. (Dragging my wife, a wildlife artist and photographer, off the balcony became a daily struggle, as she shot numerous rolls of film each day.)

Don't worry about people hurting the animals. Security cameras watch the balconies, and anyone throwing anything off gets expelled from the facility. Plus, not many spring breakers are having wild keg parties here.

Viewing areas throughout the resort area allow different views and opportunity to see animals not in your savanna. Naturalists stationed at these areas answer questions, usually with excited enthusiasm. Even the pool gives a savanna view, so it might be possible to see a giraffe while you're sitting in a hot tub.

(There are no predators on the savannas, so I guess Elton John would just call it a "Semicircle of Life.")

What about the parks?

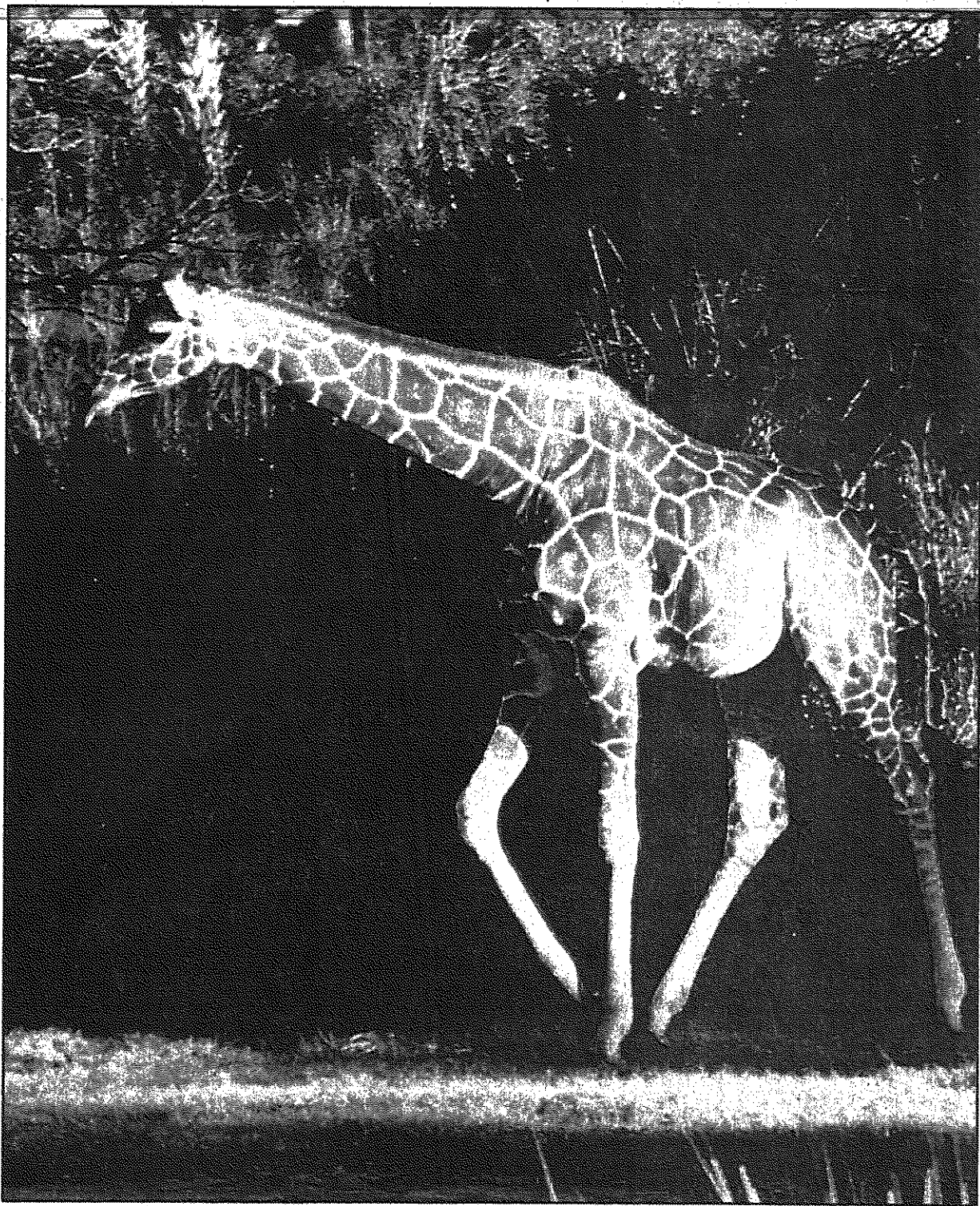
WDW has a great bus/monorail system included with your stay. Your family will probably want to spend some serious time in the lodge, so consider getting a Park Hopper pass rather than a Length of Stay pass. The Park Hopper allows you to attend any or all the parks for the number of days you pre-purchase. Length of Stay passes start the moment you arrive and end the day you leave. The Park Hopper usually saves some serious money.

Another money saving trick would be to bring breakfast food to the room with you. The parks really frown on bringing food from the outside, and, frankly, eating amusement park fare is half the fun. But the Lodge probably sells the same doughnuts or breakfast bars you bring anyway, and that's a nice savings you can put toward getting Grandma that Tigger T-shirt.

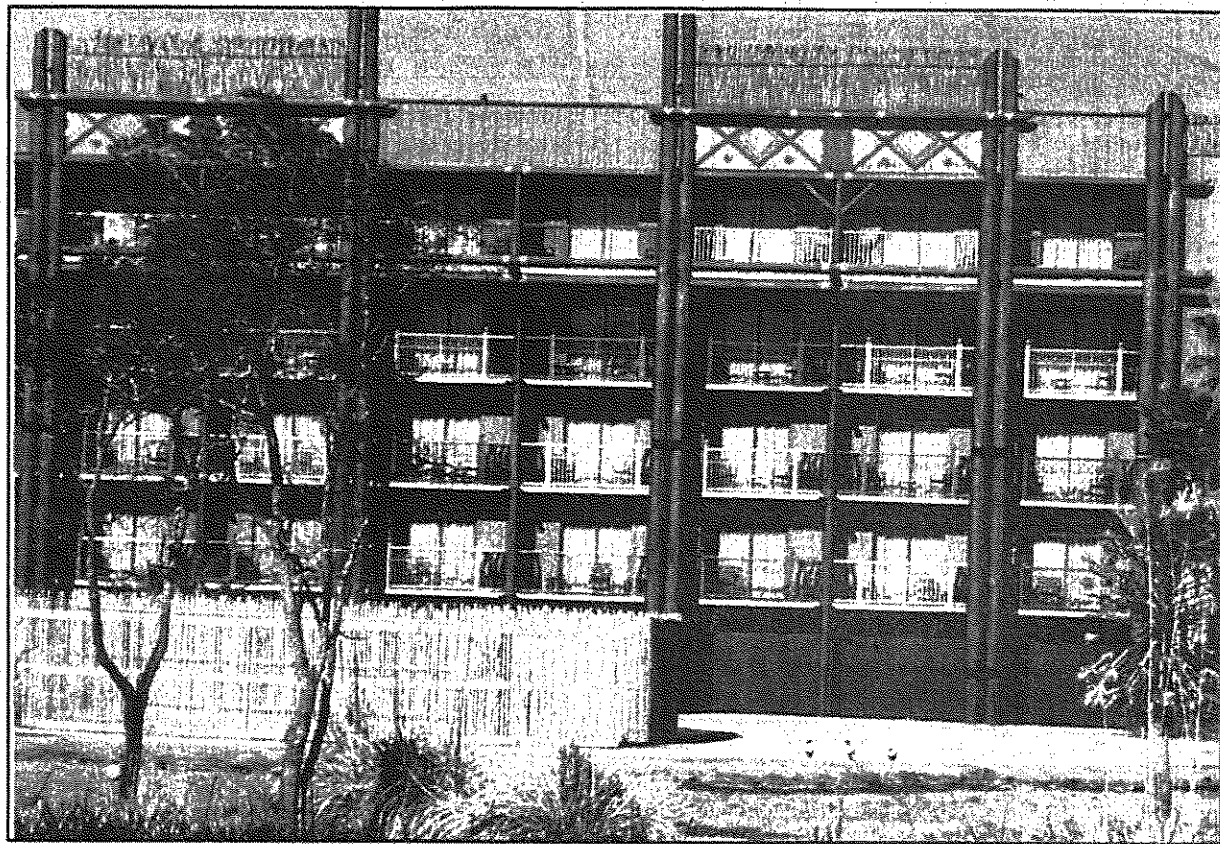
Incidentally, if you find yourself with impatient children, on a rainy night, they have TV's showing Disney movies all around the facility, including in the large, comfortable lobby, and a fireplace where African men and women tell stories and legends from their homeland.

I should mention that I'm not a shill for Disney. We stayed at the lodge for a few days receiving no discounts. Yes, after adding up the costs of travel, room rates, food, and so on, staying there can range between pricey and a small fortune.

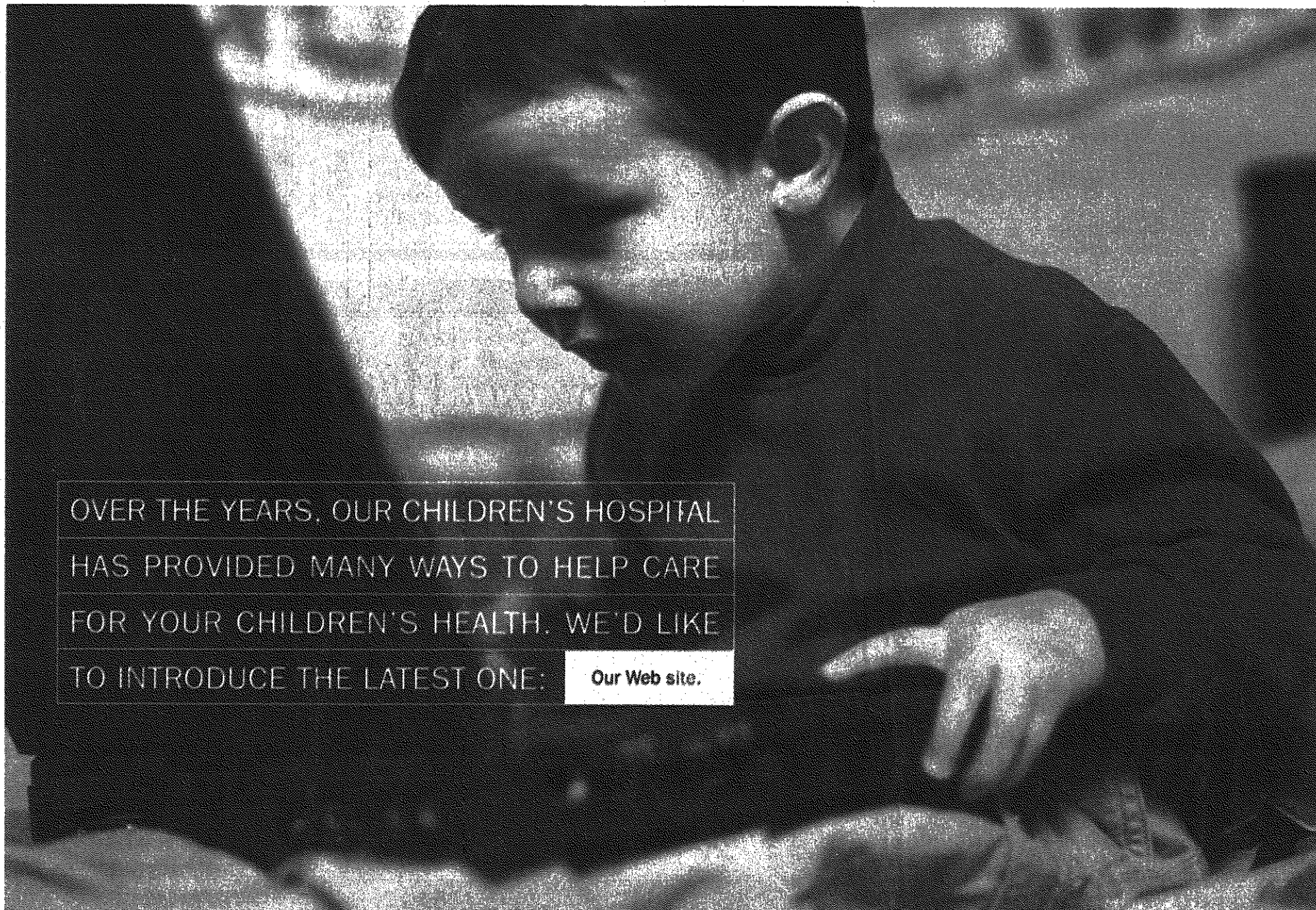

So, when that time comes, what will the coaches instruct their teams to do differently?

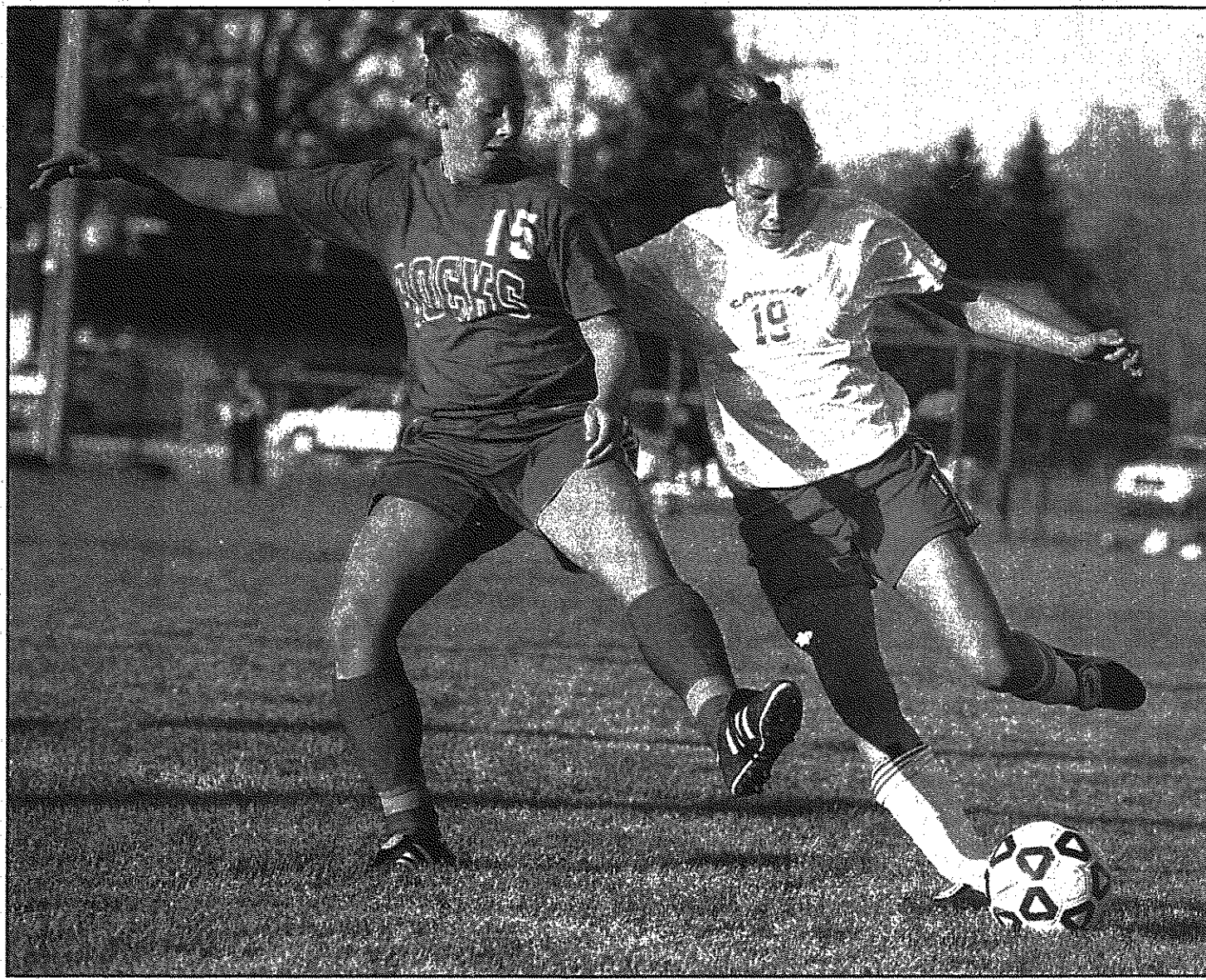
"Nothing," was how Canton's Don Smith replied.

Mid-Michigan Bucks ready to make a run

A cursory examination of the multiple situations surrounding the Mid-Michigan Bucks and one would conclude this is a soccer franchise in disarray.

Moving to a new location . . . putting together a roster just this week, with the season-opening match Saturday at the Indiana Invaders . . . losing the guy you thought would be your coach (Oakland University's Gary Parsons) and signing another (Dario Brose) less than a week before you start pre-season practice . . . still missing a half-dozen players the day before your first game.

Add to this the realization that four of your first five matches count as U.S. Open Cup qualifiers, doubling their importance, and suddenly the collar begins to tighten. Then there's last season to consider: The Bucks failed to win the Great Lakes Division in the United Soccer League for the first time

in six years of operation, finishing 10-9-1 after a series of injuries and predicaments that ultimately took six starters out of the lineup.

No, when looking at it from these perspectives, the Bucks' status would seem dire. And that would be completely incorrect.

"Everything that could go wrong (last year) went wrong," was how Jim Duggan, the Bucks' co-owner and general manager, described the 2001 campaign. And that was as much as he cared to expound on it, choosing to deal with the future rather than agonize over the past.

Which is exactly what he has done. The Bucks, who play in a Premier Developmental League (limiting the number of pro players allowed on the roster to 11), depend greatly on collegiate players. Which is why rosters cannot be finalized early; NCAA regu-

lations prohibit players from signing prior to May 1.

Duggan has recruited an impressive group of players, making this perhaps the most formidable Bucks team yet. "On paper," Duggan estimated, "this team is twice as good as last year's. There's no comparison."

"We have an All-American or pro-level player at every position. We worked hard during the off-season, recruiting, going to college games . . . I really believe that by the end of the season, we'll be phenomenal."

The key, of course, is getting that far. Because for the Bucks to succeed, for them to capture an audience, they must play well from the start. And that won't be easy.

They must jell quickly under Brose, a 32-year-old former standout who to play for the MLS champion San Jose Earthquakes last year before a series of injuries forced him into retirement.

Brose has never coached anything higher than an under-12 team before. That makes this a challenge, to be

sure.

"With being a coach come different responsibilities," he admitted. "When you're a player, your role is defined on the field. As a coach, you have to deal with a lot of different personalities."

Sorting through his talent pool, which Brose noted is good enough to "easily field two teams," is his biggest task.

"If I'd had a preseason, I might have gone with a different lineup," Brose said. "Now, I just have to go with what people are comfortable with."

"I'll try to keep them in their comfort zone. And if they're not (comfortable), well, we have someone else behind them who's just as good."

To that end, Brose plans to use a 3-5-2 system to start. As far as team strengths, that to him is obvious.

"I feel sorry for the defenses of any other team in this league," he said. "Normally, any defense would think if they can close down a team's top two

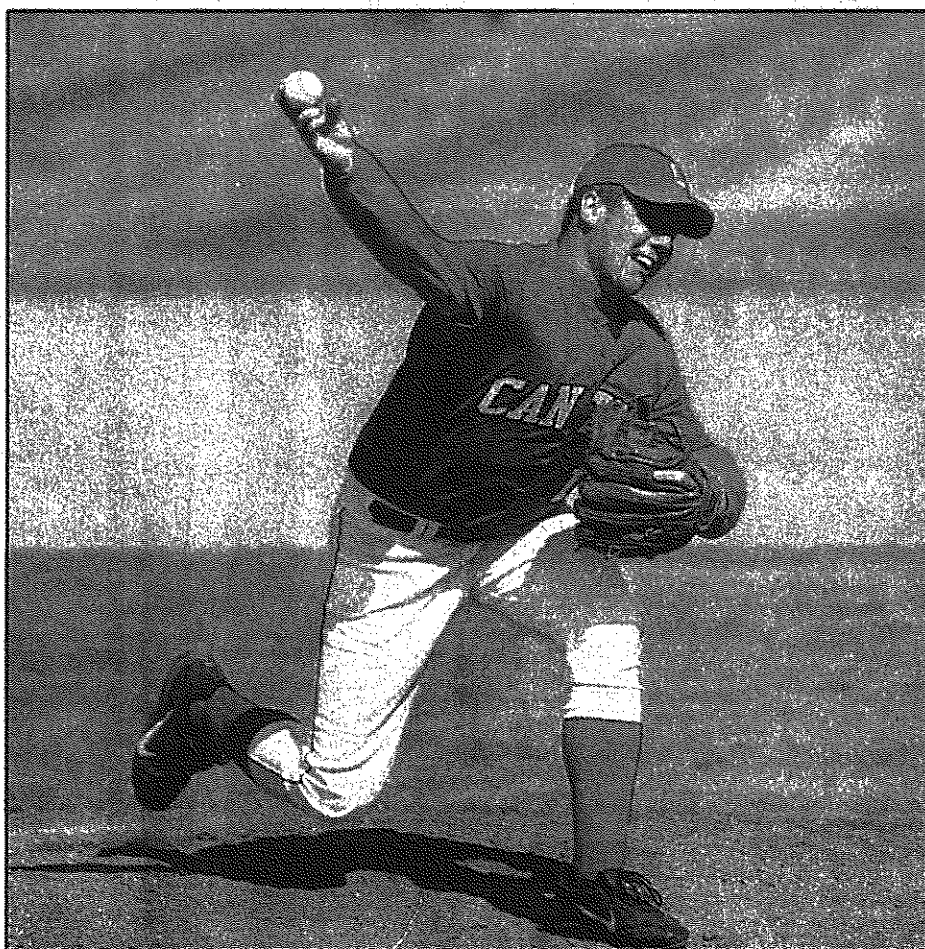

"The way I look at it, is we're playing the defending league champs on their field on a nice day, why shouldn't we come out like we want it," Riker said. "I

The Shamrocks answered in the bottom of the fifth by taking advantage of Rice mistakes. Sophomore Mike Monterey slammed a two-out double to left, and scored on an error off a hit by senior Ryan Rogowski. Freshman Eric Vojtkofsky followed with another hit that turned into an error, allowing Rogowski to score the game-winning run.

Conz started the sixth inning on the mound and was very

impressive, striking out two and forcing a double play to end the game.

"Ed's confidence started with that one-hitter he threw against DeLaSalle last week," Salter said.

Brother Rice jumped out to a 2-0 lead in game one with good plate discipline and putting the ball in play. Rosenbergh led off the game with a walk and later scored off an error to put the Warriors on the scoreboard early.

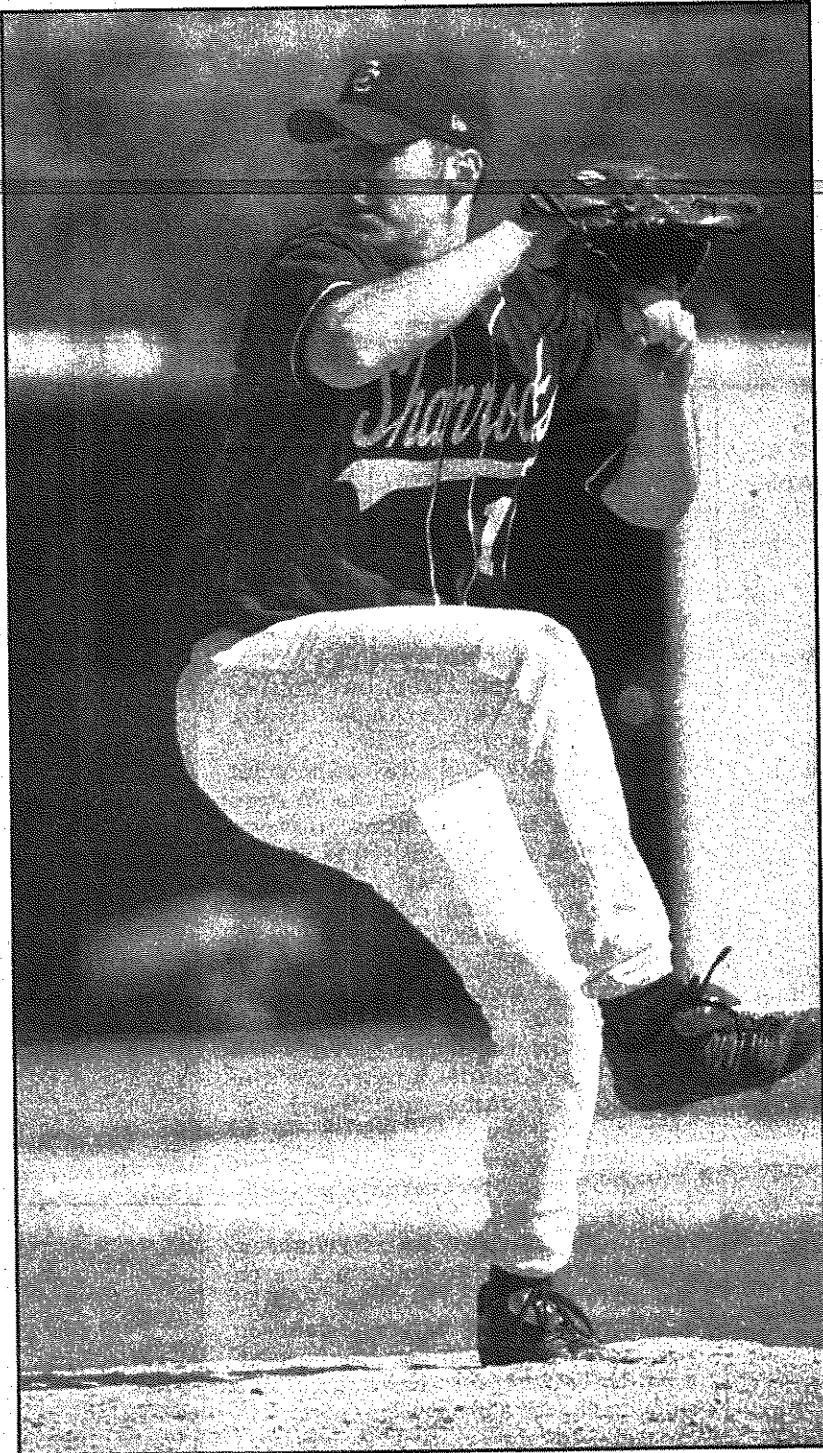

D'Herin finished with two hits and two RBI and Wildfong had two hits and an RBI.



Teens and mouthguards

Thousands of teens each year get hurt on the playing field, the basketball court, or while skateboarding, biking or during other activities. Blows to the face in nearly every sport can injure your teeth, lips, cheeks and tongue.

A properly fitted mouthguard, or mouth protector, can protect your teeth and smile. You don't have to be on the football field, however, to benefit from a mouthguard. New findings in sports dentistry show that even in non-contact sports, such as gymnastics, mouthguards help protect teeth.

There are three types of mouthguards: 1) the ready-made, or stock mouthguard; 2) the mouth formed "boil-and-bite" mouthguard; and 3) the custom-made mouthguard crafted by your dentist. Mouthguards should be resilient, tear-resistant and comfortable. They should fit properly, be durable and easy to clean, and not restrict your speech or breathing.

Before and after each use, rinse it with cold water or with an antiseptic mouth rinse. Clean it with toothpaste and a toothbrush. Store it in a firm, perforated container to allow air circulation. Avoid high temperatures, such as hot water, hot surfaces or direct sunlight, which can distort the mouthguard.

Infection control

Hospitals work vigilantly to keep germs away

There's a common belief about infection and disease the medical community would like to wash its hands of: If you want to get sick, just go to the hospital.

Interestingly, medical professionals believe vigilant hand-washing is most likely to reduce or prevent infection and disease from spreading among patients and medical professionals.

"Always number one is hand washing before patients, between patients and after patients," said Dr. Alison K. Brooks, an infectious disease specialist who treats hospital-acquired infections, such as

post-operative and diabetes-related wound infections or urinary tract infections, and community-borne diseases such as HIV, chicken pox or meningitis at Providence Hospital in Southfield. "All hospitals have an infection control protocol."

In a typical large hospital, an infection control plan may be monitored by a committee, while a smaller hospital's department may be managed by a director of nursing.

At Garden City Hospital, Laura Kehler, infection control coordinator, looks at both patient and employee safety in relation to infections.

"Our goal is to protect both patients and employees," Kehler said. "We also broaden the scope to protecting the community. Anything we might identify here in the hospital may be occurring in the community."

Hospital-derived infections

Benchmarks for incidence of infections and infectious diseases are set by the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta.

"The incidence of infection within the hospital is dependent on what procedure you have done," Brooks said. "It's also dependent on the hospital where you're being treated. All hospitals have different rates of infection occurrences....The benchmarks mean that if a hospital is over a certain amount, then you need to look at specific infection control guidelines and see what has gone wrong. But, no hospital is the same because a coronary artery bypass graft might have an X percent risk of infection, whereas an appendectomy

Reduce use of antibiotics

According to Kathy Petersen, staff specialist in infection control and epidemiology, at the University of Michigan Health System in Ann Arbor, it's a good idea to reduce antibiotic use.

"One big issue we face is resistant micro-organisms," Petersen said. "Those are bacteria that are resistant to antibiotics."

Overuse occurs when patients demand antibiotics to alleviate cold or flu symptoms. "We try to help

educate the public on when antibiotics are good to use and when they're inappropriate. Most colds and flu are caused by viruses, and not bacteria," she said. "Sometimes, antibiotic resistance develops in the hospital or a long-term care facility. Patients get antibiotics for bonafide infections, such as urinary tract infections. The antibiotics can kill all the bacteria, leaving resistant bacteria."

would have a wide percent."

Surgical site infections are fairly common, according to Kehler. "Our goal is to remain lower than the national average," she said. "The national average depends on the surgery."

Data is also derived from and provided to county and state health departments, U.S. Food and Drug Administration, Occupational Safety and Health Administration, and professional groups such as the Michigan Society for Infection Control (www.msic-online.org) and the national Association for Professionals in Infection Control and Epidemiology Inc. (www.apic.org).

Similarly, a program for "infection surveillance" is used by the U-M Health System in Ann Arbor. "We count infections to determine whether there may be an outbreak going on or to determine a baseline rate of infections," said U-M's Kathy Petersen, staff

specialist in infection control and epidemiology. "If it looks too high, then we read in the literature [for] a certain rate; and if ours is above that, we try to bring it down....We especially target procedures that are high-risk, high-volume and tend to have high morbidity."

Those procedures may include cardiac surgeries and lung and liver transplants, among others, performed in hospital settings.

"We also follow patients who have intravenous catheters placed into blood vessels for intravenous feeding or to deliver medication for development of blood infections," Petersen said.

Pneumonia and staph infections, generally, doesn't pose a high risk to other patients or medical staff.

"Depending on what type of pneumonia it is, the risk is low to others," Brooks said. "If somebody is coughing up a lot or having a lot of secretions, a

UM scientists discover new risk factor for heart disease

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - High levels of leptin, a hormone produced by fat cells in the body, could explain why obese people develop dangerous blood clots — which can cause heart attacks and strokes — more often than people who are not overweight.

The association between obesity and blood clots is well known; but the cause has remained a mystery. Now, new research with mice, conducted by scientists at the University of Michigan Medical School and published in the April 3 issue of the Journal of the American Medical Association, indicates that leptin may be responsible.

"Our results suggest that clot formation begins with some type of interaction between leptin and the leptin receptor on platelets — blood cells which stick together to make clots," says Daniel T. Eitzman, M.D., a cardiologist at the U-M Cardiovascular Center and an assistant professor of internal medicine in

the Medical School.

Knowing how to block this leptin-receptor interaction could help prevent heart attacks and strokes in people who are either obese or overweight, which is half the adult population of the United States.

According to Eitzman, leptin released by fat cells regulates body weight in part by suppressing appetite. When leptin levels in blood go up, the brain signals us to stop eating. But the system breaks down for those who are grossly overweight. Since they have more and larger leptin-producing fat cells than thinner people, their leptin levels increase substantially with every pound of additional weight gain.

When leptin reaches very high levels in the blood, Eitzman explains, obese people become resistant to leptin's signal — making them increasingly vulnerable to leptin-induced blood clotting.

While it certainly plays a major role, Eitzman emphasizes that leptin may not be the only factor involved.

"The link between obesity and cardiovascular disease is very complex, and there is much we don't know about how other blood clotting factors are regulated in obesity," he says.

Eitzman's discovery of the relationship between leptin and clotting was a lucky accident. Originally, he had no intention of focusing on leptin at all. He just wanted to examine how obesity affects blood clot formation. So he decided to use the fattest laboratory mice he could find — a strain of mutant mice that just happened to be missing the gene required to produce leptin.

When Eitzman began his experiments, the first

gown would be worn in the room over the nurse's clothing."

A patient with a staph infection that has a lot of drainage would likely be placed in a private room, Brooks added. The wound would be properly dressed by a pro wearing a gown and gloves.

Medical staff, such as nurses and technicians, generally don't mix their patient census; that is, a nurse assigned to a patient with a staph infection, for example, probably wouldn't be assigned to a post-op patient during his or her shift.

"Often, depending on what kind of an infection it is, a nurse would not work with a patient who has recently had surgery," Brooks said. "No matter what, you try not to go between patients and spread infection."

Community-borne diseases

Which infectious diseases show up in an emergency room, doctor's office or hospital setting tend to depend upon one's geographic area as well as the method of contagion — air, blood, touch or other body fluids.

"In downtown areas of large cities, tuberculosis is of concern because it's airborne," said Petersen, adding that TB

(M.tuberculosis) is a bacteria. "Diseases that are blood-borne, like hepatitis B, hepatitis C and HIV, which causes AIDS, are viruses."

Isolation procedures are followed once a contagious patient becomes known to medical authorities. "If someone is felt to have an infection that's contagious, they're isolated," Brooks said. "[Medical] folks need to protect themselves before going into a room."

When a high-risk patient is heading for surgery, infection may be controlled by administering prophylactic antibiotics, Brooks said. "Their skin is scrubbed with a special soap that decreases the amount of bacteria on the skin, so that when the skin is cut, the risk of infection is decreased," Brooks said.

Specific rooms are set aside for patients carrying air-borne diseases, such as TB, equipped with a unique air cleaning duct system that funnels the air outside and not back into the hospital room or floor.

Bio-terrorism

Since the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11 and ensuing anthrax incidents, hospitals such as the U-M Health System, have either

re-developed or refined bio-terrorism procedures.

"We found that our [original] plan, while a good one, really didn't cover all the information that we needed," Petersen said. "We added more information to our Web site and developed patient and health care guides for each of the organisms or bio-terrorism germs that we might be concerned with. If we did have an incident, we could go right to our emergency room or to the patients and hand out these guides."

Providence Hospital also had an established plan, but needed to re-train staff members about who to contact during such an emergency.

"Awareness had to be raised," Brooks said. "At that point the goal was to make sure people knew where to find what they needed to know. They needed to know who to call."

Advice to caregivers

Often, family members become caregivers to those recovering from infection or disease at home.

"Wash your hands," Brooks said. "Be careful with wounds. Follow the physician's directions. Watch for signs of infection."

results were surprising. Contrary to his expectations, leptin-deficient obese mice took nearly twice as long (an average of 75.2 minutes) to form blood clots as normal mice (42.2 minutes). Eitzman ran his experiment again — this time using a different strain of obese mice, which were missing the gene for the leptin receptor. These mice also took an abnormally long time to clot (68.6 minutes).

"Finally we tried injecting the mice with leptin, and that's when clotting times in the leptin-deficient mice dropped to normal, leptin was the critical factor. To confirm our results, we transplanted bone marrow from leptin-deficient to normal mice.

When the transplanted bone marrow began producing platelets without the leptin receptor, clotting time in the normal mice was prolonged significantly."

Recent research by other scientists found evidence for leptin's role in human blood clotting.

Results from the West of Scotland Coronary Prevention Study, published in the December 2001 issue of Circulation, showed that high levels of leptin were an independent risk factor for cardiovascular thrombotic events, such as heart attacks and strokes, in 1,160 men enrolled in the prospective study.

"We suspect that the more leptin in blood plasma, the

higher the risk of forming blood clots, but we haven't quantified the relationship yet," Eitzman says.

"We know that losing weight lowers the amount of leptin in your bloodstream, however. So for now, diet and exercise remain the best way to prevent blood clots and the strokes and heart attacks they cause."

This study was funded by the National Institutes of Health. Other U-M Medical School researchers involved in the study included Peter F. Bodary, Ph.D., the paper's lead author, who is now at the University of Toledo; Randal J. Westrick, graduate student; Kevin J. Wickenheiser, undergraduate; and Yuechen Shen, M.D., research associate.

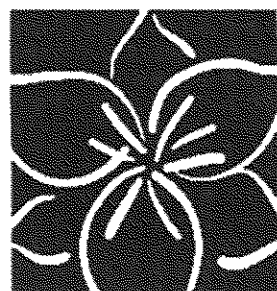

Welcome to the real world: financial advice for college grads

Congratulations on graduating from college. You've just earned a shot at financial independence. However, while the new job you secure may produce a paycheck that is substantially more than your parental allowance or income from your part-time job worked during school, you new-found freedom comes with a hefty price tag.

If you didn't learn money management in college, now's the time to do your homework to plan for your future.

Price of Independence.

A new budget should always accompany any new job. First, calculate all of your monthly fixed expenses, such as rent, utilities, auto expenses and minimum credit card and student loan payments. Compare it to your net income.

Next, analyze your discretionary spending habits. If

your entertainment expenses and even making small changes, such as buying a coffee maker to cut back on your Starbucks bill.

If you're like many new grads, you may have accumulated credit card debt while you were in school. If you owe balances on high-rate cards, look into transferring the balances to a lower interest card. You may also be carrying the burden of student loans. The good news is that on July 1, 2001, the interest rate on federal Stafford

loans dropped from 8.19 percent to 6 percent.

This rate will remain in effect through June 30, 2002. You may also be able to reduce your payments if you qualify for the Federal Direct Consolidation Loan program. Although it would lengthen the payment time, it could free up extra cash each month to pay off your high-interest credit card debt.

Another thing to consider is taxes. Remember you may now file an itemized tax return that may include deductions like job-hunting expenses, professional association dues, moving expenses related to starting a new job and charitable contributions when completing your taxes. You may also have moved to another state after graduation. In that case, be prepared to file tax returns in each state in which you resided.

Finally, try to stash away some money for cash reserves and retirement. When saving

up emergency cash, aim for at last three to six months' worth of living expenses. This is to cover unexpected expenses from job layoffs to auto repairs. You may also want to start saving for a place of your own.

Long-term financial objectives, such as retirement, may be difficult to focus on now, but it's important to start early. Through compounding interest, dollars put away in your 20s and 30s can be worth a lot more than those saved later.

An example

For example, if you saved \$100 a week starting at age 25 and earned an 8 percent return, you will have about \$400,000 more at age 65 than someone who waits until age 35 to start saving. *(The hypothetical rate of return is for illustrative purposes only and is not meant to represent the past or future returns of any specific investment or investment strategy, or to imply guaranteed earnings. Actual*

rates of return will fluctuate.)

If you stayed in college longer or continued onto grad school, you may be making more money right out of school, but you'll still have to manage your money wisely. The budgetary and savings principals for four-year grads also apply to this group.

First of all, the longer you stay in school, the more debt you are likely to have. Law and medical students have some of the largest student loans to pay when they graduate.

Your credit card debt might also be higher than someone who just went for a four-year degree. With the money you're making now, it's key to aggressively attack that debt.

You may feel confident about your current earnings, but what would you do if those paychecks suddenly stopped? Health insurance is your first priority, as hospital bills can be extremely costly adding to your already

significant debt. If you're not covered under a group plan, see if you can join a trade association that offers group-rate policies. Disability and life insurance are the next logical steps, but are greater concerns if you have dependents.

Disability insurance can typically replace up to 60 percent of your income if you can't work for an extended period due to illness or injury.

Making it on your own financially may involve issues with which you are not familiar, so don't be afraid to get help. Ask your parents or family members for advice, and seek help from a qualified financial advisor in your area.

Women often fare worse than men after heart attack

Women are at higher risk than men for complications after receiving balloon angioplasty to treat a heart attack, according to the results of a Beaumont Hospital study.

Researchers at Beaumont examined the in-hospital outcomes of 3,401 patients who received angioplasty to treat their heart attack. Of the 918 women studied, 8.7 percent experienced subsequent stroke, repeat artery blockages, repeat heart attack or death.

This compares to 5.7 percent of men studied. In addition, the study found that at one-year follow-up, women continued to experience these heart problems at a higher rate than men (27 percent vs. 19 percent).

"The data suggests that just being female is a predictor for heart problems after angioplasty treatment for heart attack. What we have yet to determine is why this is the case. There may be clinical

and other factors that remain undiscovered that contribute to women being at higher risk than men," says study investigator Cindy Grines, M.D., Beaumont cardiologist.

Beaumont will further its efforts in the study and treatment of women's heart disease with the opening of the Women's Heart Center later this year

Previous studies have established that being female is a marker for poorer prognosis after heart attack and coronary artery bypass surgery.

However, the impact of gender on outcomes following angioplasty for heart attack is not well defined.

Dr. Grines says additional study is needed to help unlock this and other mysteries into why being female puts one higher risk after heart attacks and heart procedures and surgeries. Beaumont "will further its efforts in the study and treatment of women's heart disease" with the opening of the Beaumont's Women's Heart Center later this year.

Drug access program benefits needy

State Rep. Andrew Raczowski (R-Farmington) recently announced that more than \$100,000 of no-cost prescription drugs were directed to the Farmington community last year by Pfizer, Inc.

Exercise caution around strange canines, avoid dog bites

The Michigan Humane Society marks National Dog Bite Prevention Week, May 19-25, with tips for pet owners and non-owners alike.

It suggests that owners spay and neuter their dogs as well as socialize, train and supervise them.

According to the Michigan Humane Society, nearly 4.7 million people are bitten by dogs every year. About 60 percent are children.

Dog bites generate about 330,000 trips to the hospital emergency room nationwide every year. Dogs most likely to bite are those with little attention or proper handling.

The Michigan Humane Society also suggests:

■ Use caution around a dog you don't know.

■ Respect a dog's space. Never enter a strange yard or reach over a fence to pet a strange dog.

■ Never surprise a dog, especially one that is eating, sleeping or caring for puppies.

■ If a dog threatens you, avoid eye contact, stay motionless and keep your hands at your side. Teach children to stand still and "be a tree" if approached by a strange dog.

■ Dogs rarely attack without warning; potentially dangerous dogs may stare straight ahead with hair raised and teeth bared or they may growl, snarl or snap.

■ If you are knocked to the ground by a dog, pull your knees to your chest and protect your neck.

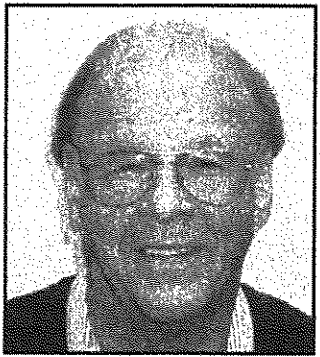

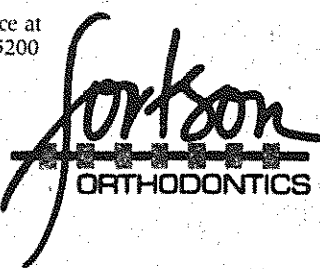

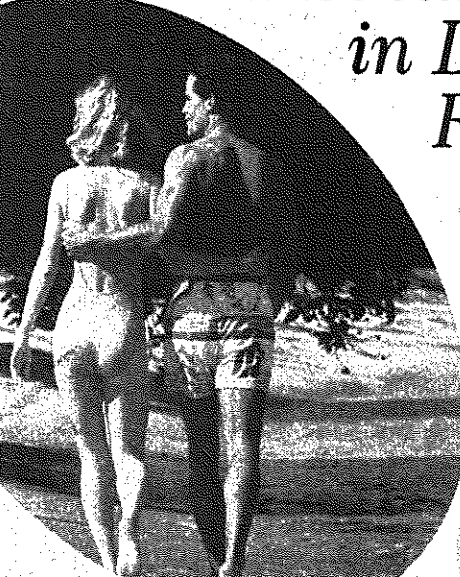

Wayne County puts kids first in nutrition programs

Thirty-two year old Kelly Tucker, wife of an unemployed Chrysler engineer and a mother of four small children, recently found herself in a desperate situation.

"I was spending fifty dollars a week just on formula", says Tucker, a resident of Wayne County whose husband has been laid off for two years. "I had to beg, borrow and plead for money from my children's grandmothers to buy regular milk. There was little money for anything else."

Tucker found relief from the Wayne County's WIC (Women, Infants and Children) program, a supplemental nutrition program that helps correct or prevent malnutrition in low-income women who recently had a baby, infants and children up to 5 years old who are at risk for inadequate nutrition.

Also, WIC is offered to low-income pregnant and breast-feeding women.

Besides WIC, the Wayne County Public Health Department offers many programs aimed at improving the health and well-being children, including immunization and dental health services.

"It is important for children to receive a healthy start in life by getting proper nutrition, good oral health care and childhood vaccinations," says Patricia Soares, Public Health Director for Wayne County. "These essentials lay the foundation for children to enjoy a lifetime of excellent physical and mental health."

The health department offers a variety of disease preventive services aimed to improve and maintain the health of infants, children and youth in Wayne

County:

Childhood Vaccinations

Immunizations are provided at several health department locations to parents who do not have insurance coverage or who cannot afford to pay for shots. The following vaccinations are needed by age two and can be given in five visits or less:

- Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough) (MMR)
- Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR)
- Polio
- HIB meningitis
- Hepatitis B

Dental Program

Parents who take early dental action can insure the health of their children's teeth and help make going to the dentist a pleasurable experience. The health department's dental unit

offers a variety of preventive and restorative services for Medicaid and low-income children 3-18 years old that include: Sealants, cleanings, fluorides, fillings, extractions and root canals.

Using a "show and tell" format, the campaign features a group of characters called the Dental Force - "Flossie," "Toothie," "Strengthor" and others to entertain kids while teaching them about proper dental care and good oral hygiene. The Health Connector Van, a mobile unit that houses a traveling dental office, goes to where the children are and provides dental care, nutritional counseling and follow-up appointments.

WIC Program

WIC is a special supplement-

tal nutrition program that helps to correct or prevent malnutrition in low-income pregnant and breastfeeding women. WIC is offered to women who recently had a baby, infants and children up to 5 years old who are at risk due to inadequate nutrition. WIC is a free service and is effective in improving infant birth weight and the diet and length of pregnancy for pregnant women.

WIC provides:

■ Food coupons, redeemable for nutritious food items at area grocery stores

■ Nutrition education

■ Referral service to health insurance, food stamps, immunizations and family planning

Researchers question the 'placebo effect'

Some sick people get well when they are told their medicine is good for them.

Is this the "placebo effect"? No according to a medical anthropologist at the University of Michigan-Dearborn and a colleague affiliated with the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences in Maryland.

"We argue that as currently used, the concept of the 'placebo effect' includes much that has nothing to do with placebos, confusing the most interesting and important aspects of the phenomenon," the researchers said. "We propose a new way to understand these aspects of medical care by focusing on the idea of 'meaning,' to which people, when they are sick, often respond."

Looking at the "meaning" of medical care will probably lead to far greater insight into how treatment works, and perhaps to real improvement in human well-being, according to the researchers.

UM-Dearborn anthropologists Daniel E. Moerman and Wayne Jonas, a medical doctor at the

Samueli Institute and the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences in Maryland, discuss these issues in an article published in the April 5 issue of Annals of Internal Medicine, titled "Deconstructing the Placebo Effect and Finding the Meaning Response."

In the article, Moerman and Jonas cite numerous studies that were intended to test the placebo effect, but found something else instead. One test, for example, changed the color and number of pills provided to medical students, after asking them to test stimulants and tranquilizers. The students indicated that they thought red pills were stimulants and blue pills were depressants, and that two tablets had more effect than one.

"The students were not responding to the inertness of the tablets," according to Moerman and Jonas. "Instead, their responses can be explained by the 'meanings' in the experiment: red means 'up,' 'hot,' 'danger,' while blue means 'down,' 'cool,' 'quiet,' and two means more than one."

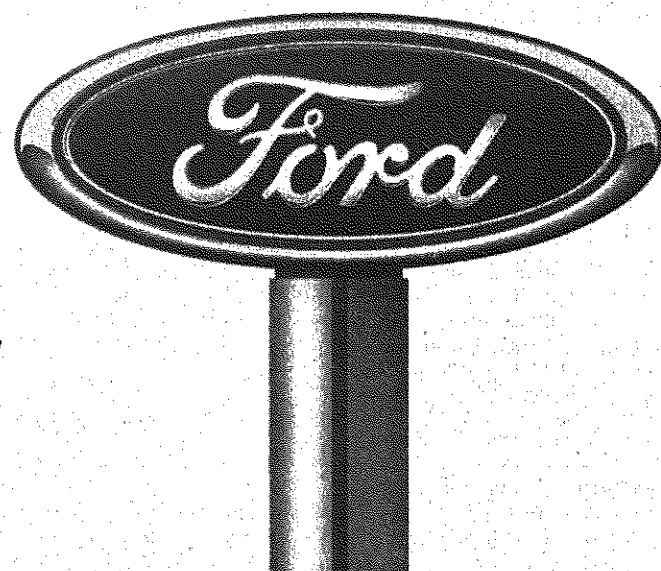

Luxury dream community slowly evolves

Walnut Brook Estates, so far 17 years in the developing, still has room for homeowners who want what its creator believes is the ideal in luxury living.

"My main concern is first, the customer, then the community," said Gary Leigh, developer. "We manage the entire process, make sure it's a wonderful experience for people."

The detached site condominium development ultimately will consist of 93 residences on 85 acres off South Boulevard between Coolidge and Crooks in Rochester Hills. About half of the custom homes have been built.

Lots, sold only to individuals not builders, range from just under a half acre to just over two acres and cost \$400,000 to \$1.6 million.

Leigh runs what he describes as a turnkey operation, where buyers are referred to specific architects, designers, builders and landscapers to help produce the ultimate in a residential living experience.

"The key over the years is to find quality people to do these things," Leigh said. "We have 55 quality covenants to protect the community."

Jan Bohr, turnkey program manager at Walnut Brook, describes how it works.

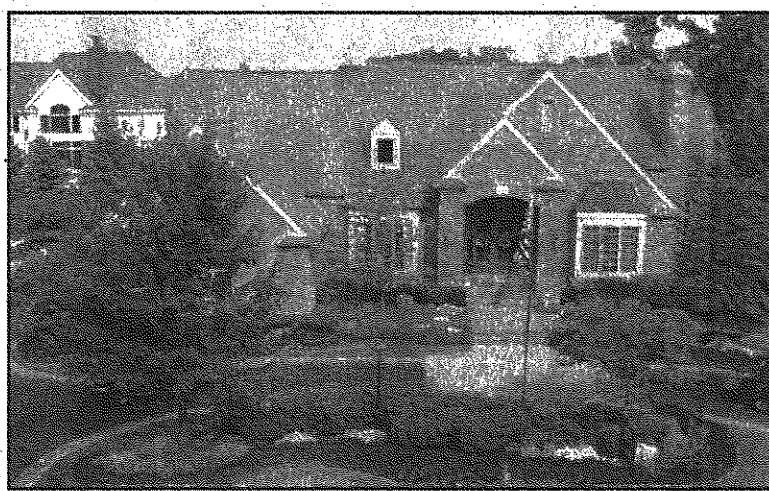
"When you purchase a lot, it's up to you to decide when you build. Once you decide, I introduce you to architects, builders, landscape architects.

"You decide who will design. I work with you on choices for flooring, cabinets. You've already met the builders. We give the package to them and they bid.

"We prefer that the landscape architect gets involved up front with the architect for drainage purposes," Bohr said.

Leigh's turnkey team consists of architects David Lubin, Bloomfield Hills, and Peter Maniacai, Orionville; and builders Anthony DiVergilio Jr., West Bloomfield, and Dennis Glick, Bloomfield Hills.

Designers are Susan Murphy, Troy, and Lisa Skocelos, Bloomfield Hills; and landscape architects are Eron Kleckner, West Bloomfield, and Paul Nakolan, Phoenix, Ariz.

Construction takes about a year once begun.

Lot purchasers can bring in their own builders, but only after Leigh approves the quality of their work and their plans.

Traditional exteriors are required, with no duplication in specifics. Ranches must be at least 3,200 square feet, story-and-a-half, 3,700 square feet, and two story, 4,200 square feet.

Aluminum or vinyl siding aren't permitted.

"Now, there are seven homes under construction in here from \$1.2 to \$4 million," Leigh said.

"The thing I hear is people like being completely surrounded and protected," he said. "On the west side is Pine Trace golf club, on the east border, a wildlife sanctuary. I have over a mile of nature trails, several picnic areas."

The folks on Leigh's turnkey team look forward to the challenge.

"Walnut Brook is a labor of love," Lubin said. "It's very special. Everything is controlled and designed to blend together."

"My role is translating, kind of taking their (clients') vision and articulating it in a way to make them most comfortable in the home," Murphy said.

"I think attention to detail with materials used, how you place them and how the team

works together all adds up to being an enjoyable experience," Glick said.

"Understand there's three basic things we're trying to balance — quality, time and budget," said DiVergilio. "I try to establish that up front. The most important to me is quality."

Leigh has built a story-and-a-half Showcase Idea Home as his sales center. The house contains four bedrooms, four full baths, two half baths and five fireplaces.

There's a three-car garage and two laundries. The home has two separate staircases going up and two down.

Flooring includes marble, limestone and granite, countertops granite. Most rooms have volume ceilings.

The first-floor living area contains a foyer/gathering area; library; a master with jet tub and separate shower, two-sink vanity and two-walk-in closets; dining room; butler's pantry; great room; and kitchen/nook/sitting area.

Three bedrooms, including a guest suite with full bath, are upstairs.

Some 3,200 square feet in the basement have been finished to include a home theater, two game rooms, office, exercise room, wine cellar and a bar with full kitchen.

Nearly a dozen people are on a waiting list to eventually buy

the idea home, which currently carries a price of over \$2 million, Leigh said.

The community will be gated with an electronic security system. A 12,900-square-foot clubhouse, swimming pool and tennis courts are in the planning stages.

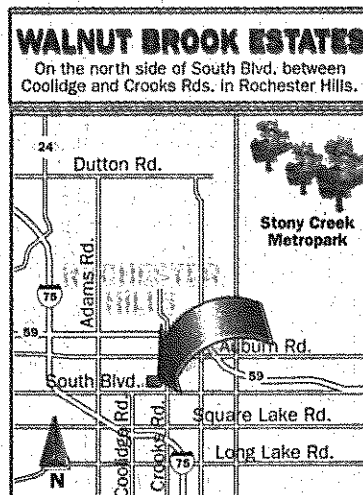
Walnut Brook is serviced by city water and sewers and is within the Avondale school boundaries. There are no sidewalks.

The property tax rate is \$33.79 per \$1,000 of state tax-

able value, half of sales price for new construction. That means the owners of a \$2 million home there would pay about \$33,800 the first year.

The annual association fee is \$1,100 and concierge services are available for an addition fee.

The Showcase Idea Home at Walnut Brook, (248) 299-0030, is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. Leigh, Extension 109, will meet prospective buyers by appointment.
