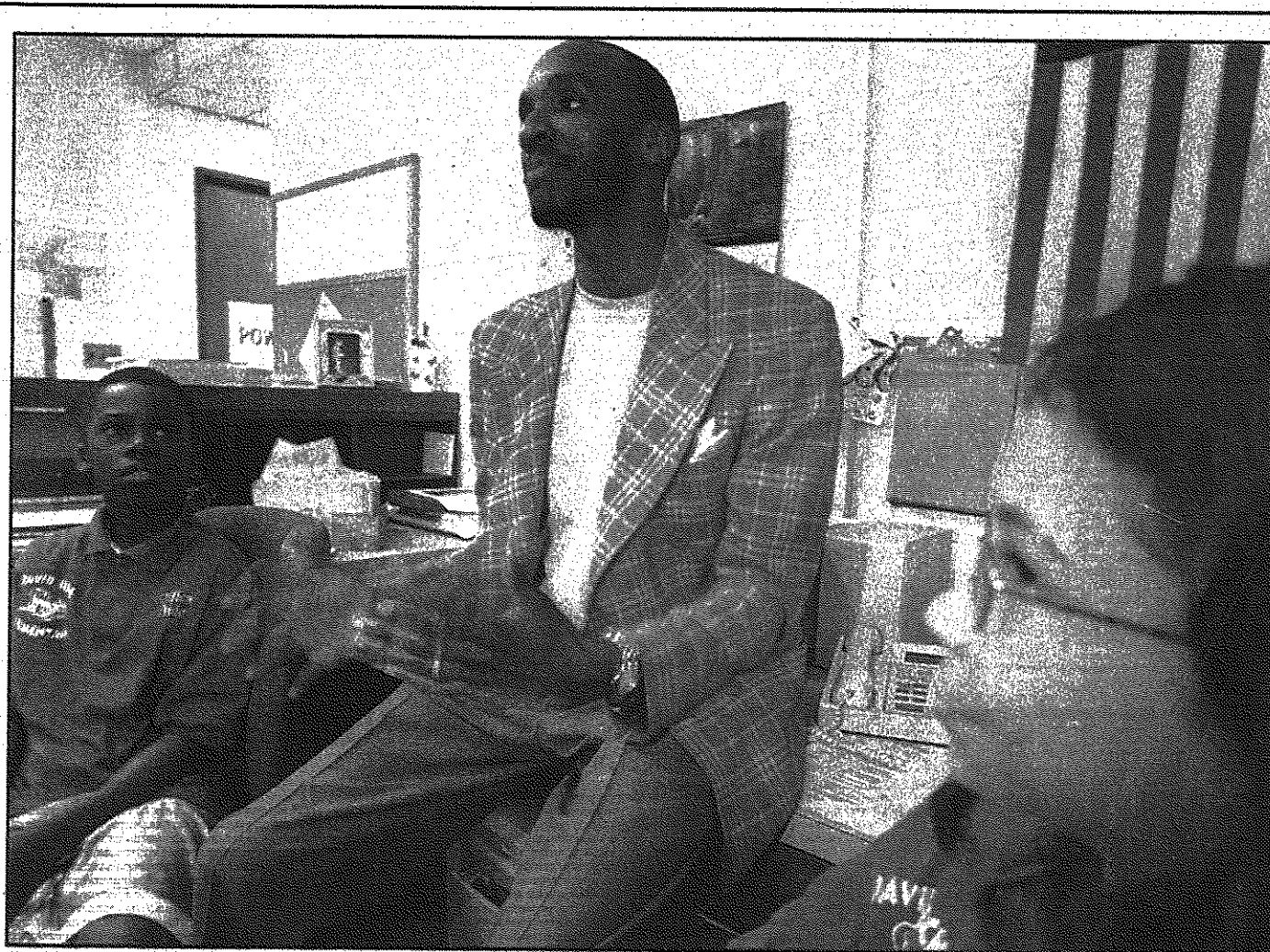

Principal's research looks at the minority learning gap

Benjamin Edmondson has a strong interest in the achievement gap among minority students. That's the focus of his doctoral dissertation at Eastern Michigan University. "I have a lot of work to do," said Edmondson, principal for the last year and a half at Hicks Elementary in the Wayne-Westland school district. He can see the end in sight on work for his Ed.D. degree in educational leadership, hoping to finish by March 2003. Edmondson, 33, of Plymouth



Virginia and a master's in educational theory and practice from Ohio State University. Edmondson came from a comfortable background, his dad a dentist and his mom a teacher. Even so, he remembers earning lower college-

admission test scores than white classmates.

Other studies show that African-American and Latino students lag behind white and Asian counterparts as early as kindergarten, he said. That's true even when adjustments are made for income.

One interesting theory is that the achievement gap, which had narrowed in the early 1980s, widened again in the late 1980s with rap TV. Edmondson's not sure about that theory, but interested in looking at it and others.

Multi-talented TV anchor shines at Author Lunch

He picked up his guitar and played. He read his first children's book - from memory. He devoted maybe a minute to talking about his career in local television news.

Devin Scillian gave a crowd of nearly 300 at Wednesday's 16th annual Friends Author Luncheon exactly what it wanted. The broadcast journalist spent some 40 minutes addressing his "other" avocations and talking about growing up as an Army brat.

He also left the audience with a couple of deftly delivered messages about the permanence and intellectual stimulation books still offer in an increasingly media-frenzied world.

"Books are more powerful than any other media. And the power of books is

that we use our minds to shape the words into what we want them to mean," the WDIV-TV anchor said.

"We fill in the blanks."

The luncheon, held for the first time at the Summit, is hosted by the Friends of the Canton, Plymouth, Novi and Northville libraries. The event is sponsored by the Observer Newspapers and Hometown Newspapers, part of the Hometown Communications Network.

Proceeds are used for a variety of projects at all four libraries ranging from material purchases to children's programming.

"I thought the program was wonderful," said Evelyn Smith of Plymouth. "He has a real talent and a way of drawing you into his books and music."

Scillian has written three children's

Air National Guard officer to speak at local Memorial Day ceremonies

Canton resident Carol Ann Fausone, newly-appointed Brig. Gen in the Michigan Air National Guard, will be the keynote speaker for area Memorial Day Ceremonies.

Fausone will speak Monday morning following the Plymouth-Canton Memorial Day Parade, which honors veterans who gave their lives fighting for America.

A 20-minute Memorial Day ceremony

will also be held at the Veterans Monument behind Canton's Municipal Building. The ceremony begins at 11 a.m.

Parade organizer Dennis Shrewsbury of Plymouth, a member of the Plymouth-Canton Vietnam Veterans Association Chapter 528, believes the public has more appreciation for those who fought, especially since the terrorist attacks.

"I think there's a heightened awareness of patriotism by the public since Sept. 11," said Shrewsbury. "Around

this area, there's always been a core group who appreciate servicemen. However, I think there's been an increased enthusiasm and appreciation for those who fought and died."

Shrewsbury said he gets a great sense of pride when marching along parade routes with his Vietnam veterans group.

"Many times the applause is continuous and sustained throughout the parade route," he said. "Sometimes I get all choked up ... and I wasn't even

Yack backing Schwarz

■ Canton Supervisor Tom Yack has weighed in on the governor's race, going with the perceived Republican darkhorse. It's the first time the supervisor has made a high-profile endorsement at the top of the ticket.

Canton Township Supervisor Tom Yack has endorsed State Sen. Joe Schwarz (R-Battle Creek) in his bid for governor.

"He's the only candidate on either side of the aisle who has local government experience," Yack said Thursday. "I've never felt that (Gov. John) Engler and by extension his lieutenant governor (Dick Posthumus) has valued local government."

Schwarz served as mayor of Battle Creek from 1985-87 and served on the Battle Creek City Commission from 1979-85.

Yack's endorsement announcement was made at a press conference in Lansing on Wednesday. It's the first time Yack, who's been supervisor since 1988, has made such a high-profile endorsement of a gubernatorial candidate.

"Tom has been an asset to Canton Township and Wayne County for many years," Schwarz said in a news release. "I am honored to receive his endorsement for my candidacy."

Asked how he thought his endorsement would be viewed by members of the Republican hierarchy, Yack said, "The conventional wisdom is that all Republicans back Posthumus ... but that's conventional thinking."

Yack said in addition to Schwarz's local government experience, he liked his stand on continued funding of education and health issues.

The number of Plymouth-Canton teachers scheduled to be laid off could be reduced to less than half the 18 that were approved by the Board of Education April 23.

Trustees will be asked to vote on a resolution Tuesday night, recalling 11 of the teachers who received pink slips.

Ray Bihun, the executive director of human resources for the district, said because of a number of circumstances such as retirements, leaves of absences

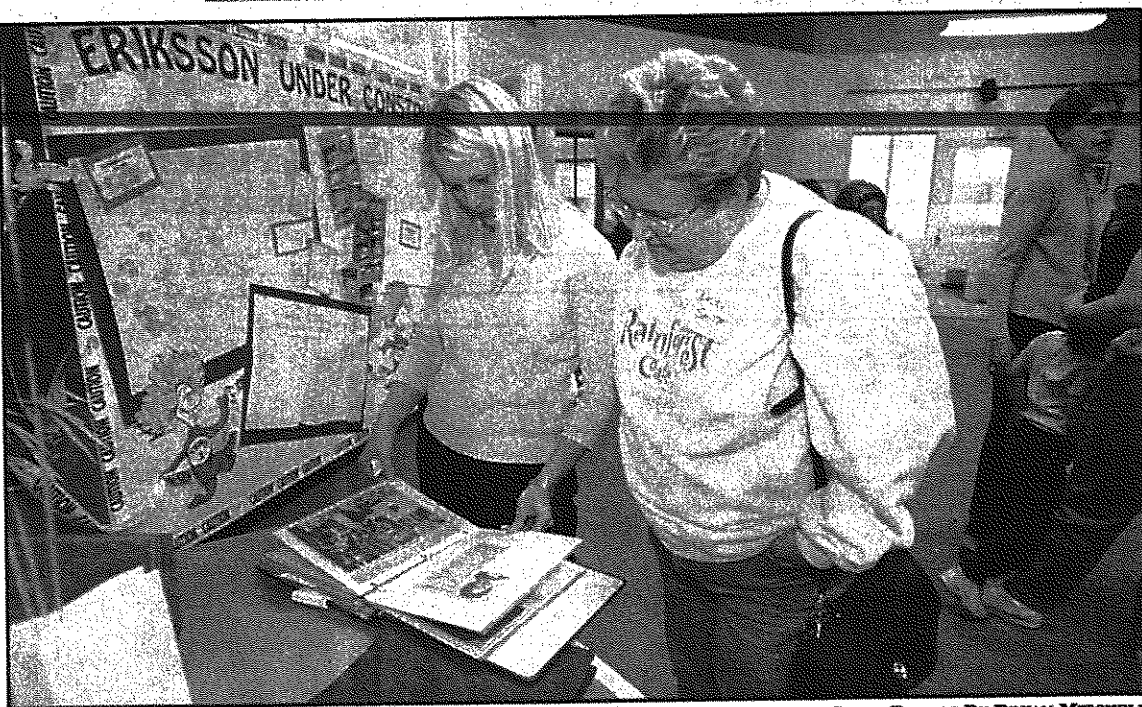

in Vietnam, and it makes feel good."

The parade starts at 7:30 a.m. at the corner of Theodore Main in downtown Plymouth.

3-on-3 tourney is benefit

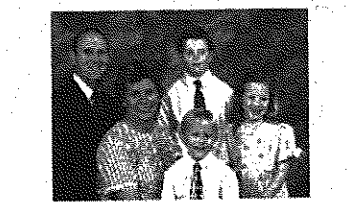

Patches of unity

East quilt honors 9-11 emotions

On Sept. 11, no one was immune to the myriad of emotions associated with the shock of the U.S. being attacked on its own soil, and the thousands of lives that were lost and changed forever. It became a time when people reflected, wondering what they could do to help those affected by the tragedy, as well as to calm their own fears. "I was sitting in church the following weekend dealing with all the emotions of what went on, and on the wall was a quilt," said Diane Kimball of Plymouth Township, a foreign language teacher at East Middle School in Plymouth. "I thought about doing something positive to amplify the sense of community we have in our school, especially with the diversity we have. I was wondering how to display that when I saw the quilt, and knew that was it."

For nearly seven months, students composed essays detailing their thoughts, and designed patches for the quilt, which was recently sewn together and will soon be on display at the school.

In her essay, Meredith Beems of Canton wrote, "If something positive has come from the September 11th attack, it has been our unified

spirit as a nation. People today seem to be friendlier, more patient, and display a greater sense of tolerance for one another."

Rabia Naqvi of Canton is an Arab-American, and she understood the significance of her message, which is displayed on the quilt.

"I drew a peace sign, with peace written in Arabic and English," said Naqvi. "Not all Arabs are Muslims, and most people are thinking that all terrorists are Arabs."

Nivedhitha Subramanian of Canton drew a flower with 66 petals, representing the number of nations who lost countrymen in the World Trade Center collapse.

"Each petal on a flower is

like a single country in our world," wrote Subramanian. "When the petals stay together, the flower is a beautiful part of nature. When all of the countries stay together, the world is a peaceful part of the universe."

Angela Hogan, an East math teacher, said the essays and quilt helped students deal with the tragedy surrounding them.

"They didn't know how to react, so this was a positive way for them to react," said Hogan.

"What was really nice was that we had such a diverse group of kids working on this project," added East teacher Danielle Wren. "It was a way for the students to unite."

Event is memorial to daughter, benefit for cerebral palsy battle

Dave and Lynn Garr have organized a charity golf event in memory of their baby daughter, Vanessa, who died of cerebral palsy last July.

She was 12 days past her second birthday when something went wrong in her sleep – possibly a seizure – and she succumbed.

"In the process of going to therapy for her we met a lot of similar families and made a lot of friends in the same situation, so we want to help them," Dave Garr said.

"She was a real fighter," Garr says of his daughter. "She has more courage than I could ever imagine."

Garr said the experience dramatically changed his views about people with a disability. "I got a whole new perspective ... it was a life-altering experience."

What the Garrs have planned is the first annual Vanessa Grace Garr Memorial Golf Outing to benefit United Cerebral Palsy of Metro Detroit.

The outing will be held on Saturday, July 13, at The Links of Novi, Ten Mile Road just west of Wixom Road, starting at 11 a.m. Cost is \$125 per player with

each participant getting 18 holes of golf with a power cart, hot dog or hamburger lunch, New York strip steak dinner with door prize raffle in the evening, three hours of open bar, and a silent auction with autographed sports memorabilia.

Non-golfers can enjoy the steak dinner for \$50.

"During her two years with us our daughter Vanessa endured various medical problems along with extensive physical and occupational therapies in an

attempt to gain a more comfortable lifestyle and deal with her cerebral palsy," Garr said.

"We never had the joy of watching our daughter walk or crawl, not for a lack of effort on her part. This little girl had more fight and determination in her than many athletes of today."

Garr said they realized she was not alone in her terrible struggle, and decided to raise money with the golf event.

Anyone wishing tickets, or wishing to donate items for the door prize raffle can contact Garr at (734) 454-7178.

Cerebral palsy is a broad term covering many brain damage injuries, usually those happening at birth. Garr said his daughter's affliction was caused by a doctor's error.

United Cerebral Palsy of Detroit is an United Way charity that was founded in 1949; 85 cents of every dollar raised goes to programs and services, according to the charity.

Garr, who has lived in Canton five years, is a sales representative.

His wife Lynn is a medical assistant at the Providence Hospital facility in Novi, and has lived in Canton eight years.

HomeTown Communications joins advertising network

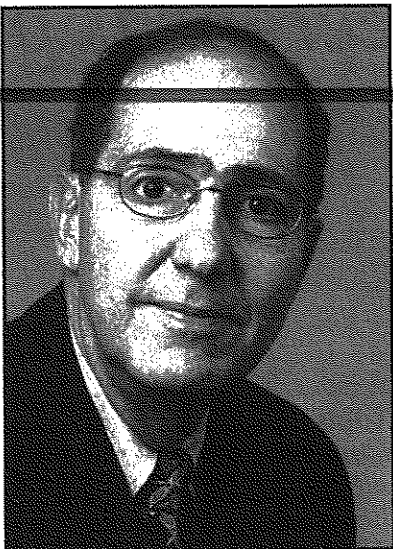

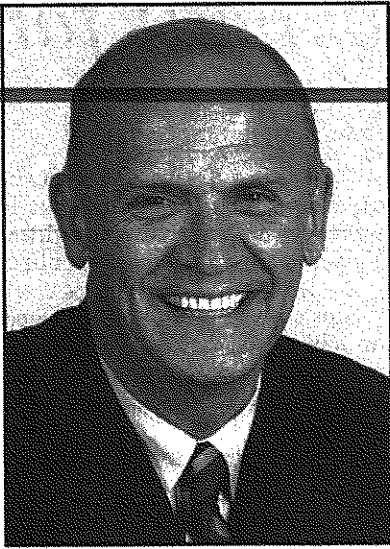

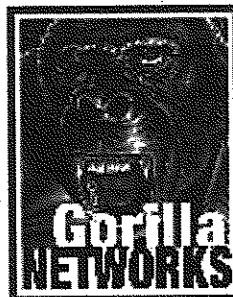

He's seen some lower scores in math on the Michigan Educational Assessment Program tests at Hicks.

He's currently calling his dissertation "Leveling the Playing Field: The Effects of Parenting and Small Class Sizes on the Academic Achievement Gap."

Smaller classes help in that students receive more individual attention, he said. The Wayne-Westland district has made a commitment to smaller classes in early elementary grades.

Edmondson's research and that of others shows interesting differences in parenting. African-American parents tend to sing and dance with kids, he said, whereas Caucasians talk and read to their children.

"So we're very oral people. We have a rich tradition of oral history."

Blacks were banned from learning to read for much of American history, he noted, adding he's not belittling African-American parenting styles. Such historical realities as slavery and more recent Jim Crow laws enforcing segregation are still having an impact.

He agreed that talking about race and learning can make some people uncomfortable. Edmondson, whose staff is mostly Caucasian, believes it's a good thing to discuss such issues. "It is uncomfortable, but my staff is willing to talk about it."

The ultimate goal is to have all students do well. "You want to make an impact," said Edmondson. His EMU professor told him to look at what he sees now and what he would like to see.

"That's my ultimate goal, to make a difference." He's looking forward to applying his research at Hicks.

Edmondson has some down-to-earth advice for all parents: spend time with children, read to them and have them read to you, and be proactive in working with the school staff.

Edmondson is among several Wayne-Westland educators pursuing doctorates, said Greg Baracy, school superintendent. "It is an awful lot of work," said Baracy, who holds a doctor of education degree from Wayne State University.

Doctoral candidates are required to defend their dissertation, he said. "We're very proud of all of our administrators who are involved in that program." Their studies are good for the district and its students, Baracy said.

The minority learning gap is disputed by some, the superintendent said. Learning about student achievement is vital, he added. "This research will help us determine that."

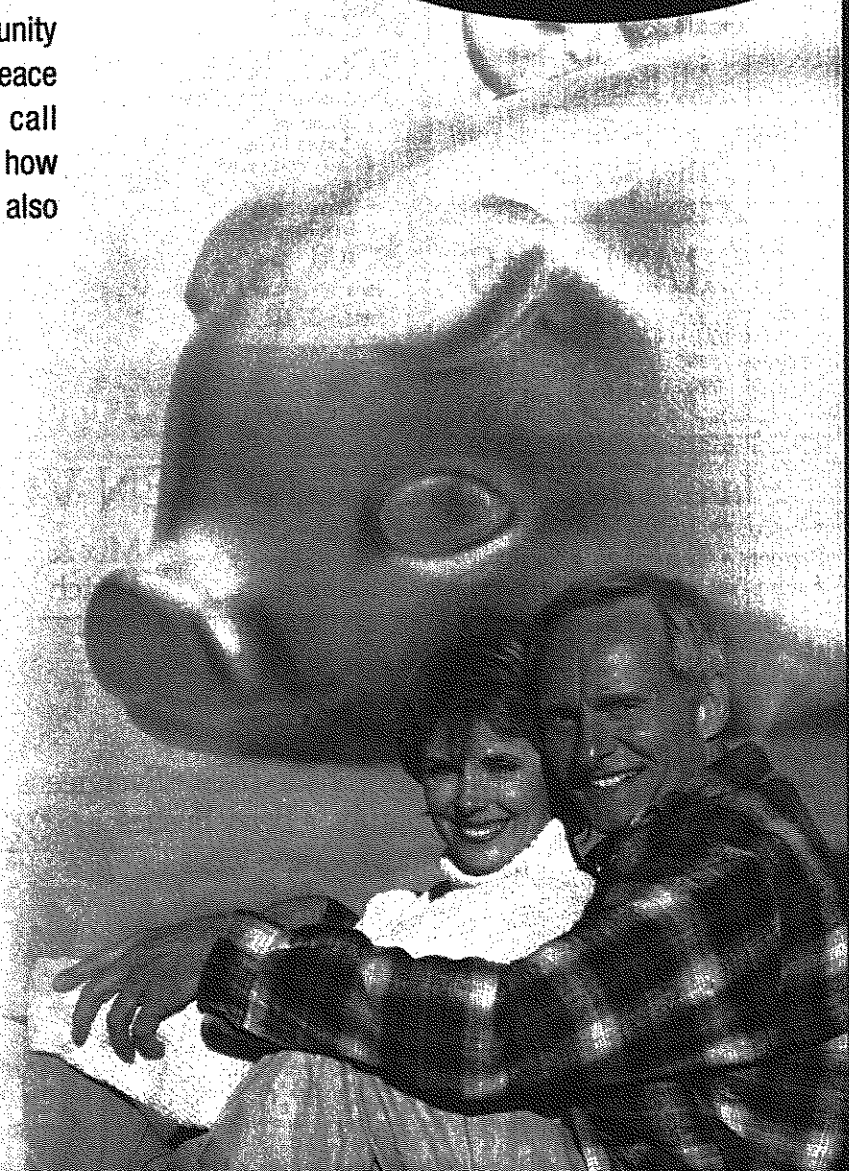

Police ticket students in counterfeiting case

Canton police have cited two 14-year-old township youths in connection with the passing of counterfeit money at Discovery Middle School May 6.

Meanwhile, Plymouth police continue their investigation into a similar incident at Central Middle School.

Canton police Sgt. Todd Mutchler said the two Canton teens will be cited under a local ordinance involving fraudulent schemes for their part in passing

a counterfeit \$20 bill in the Discovery cafeteria.

"The parents are very receptive and concerned with the act their sons did, and we're confident they are also dealing with the incident at their level," said

Mutchler.

Mutchler said one of the teens made the fake money with the help of a computer and scanner.

"He made several bills and passed them to a friend at Discovery," said Mutchler. "He

obviously knew the severity of what he did because he destroyed the other copies."

Mutchler said the other teen "knew the money was counterfeit" when he tried to pass it off in the cafeteria.

The U.S. Secret Service had been called in to investigate, but because the incident involved juveniles the federal agency handed the case back to Canton police. Mutchler said the two boys will be sentenced through 35th District Court, and could receive a maximum 90 days in jail.

School officials said the teens were given five-day suspensions.

Mutchler said detectives determined the incident was not connected to a similar incident at Central Middle School April 24.

"We believe someone heard about what happened at Central, which may have prompted the Discovery incident," he said.

Meanwhile, Plymouth police Det. Lt. Ed Ochal said there are no dispositions yet involving a 13-year-old boy who reportedly took five fake \$20 bills to Central. The teen reportedly asked two students to exchange some

of the money into smaller denominations. Police said several students came into possession of the fake bills, which were used to buy items in the school cafeteria.

The Central investigation also resulted in police questioning the teen's 16-year-old brother and their 18-year-old friend. A computer was confiscated at the home of the oldest suspect.

Judy Evola, director of communications for Plymouth-Canton Schools, said five Central students were given suspensions, ranging from 3-5 days.

At the Lansing press conference, Schwarz also picked up the endorsement of Mark Mandell, chairman of the Wayne 13th Congressional Republican Committee, which covers the western Wayne County suburbs.

Several trustees had concerns about the impact of pay raises for the four employee groups which are currently negotiating contracts with the district. The largest is the Plymouth Canton Education Association with more than 1,000 members.

"But it's also possible, after more information, we might ask for a little bit deeper, whether that be in expense line items or people," he said.

1,600 volunteers expected for annual Rouge Rescue

Having celebrated its 15th anniversary last year, Rouge Rescue has become an annual institution for many Wayne and Oakland communities that lie within a watershed covering more than 400 miles.

Since it was founded in 1986 by Jim Murray, who is now the head of Wayne County's Dept. of Environment, Rouge Rescue (now called River Day) has continued to grow in both size and expectation.

This year's event, which will take place Saturday, is no different.

An estimated 1,600 volunteers are anticipated to participate at 24 different sites throughout the watershed, according to Carolyne Foster, managing director of Friends of the Rouge, which is a network of volunteers trying to restore the long-neglected watershed.

That is up from the 1,300 people who showed up at 23 sites last year.

"We're really excited. The word is getting out," Foster said. "It seems every year, more communities are getting involved, and trying to encourage as many volunteers as possible to come out and help clean up the Rouge. The communities are recognizing the Rouge does have problems, and it needs our help."

Dramatic improvement

Once one of the most polluted rivers in the nation, the Rouge River has shown dramatic improvements in recent years, both in water quality and its ability to sustain fish and wildlife.

Despite the fact the watershed lies within a highly urbanized area (more than 1.5 million people in 48 communities live within the watershed), more than 50 miles of the Rouge flows through public parklands, making it one of the most accessible rivers in the state.

While there is still a need to clean out shopping carts and other man-made garbage at many Rouge Rescue sites, some communities are shifting their focus on other activities, such as streambank stabilization and the planting of native plants along the river.

"A lot of sites are concentrating on the planting of native plants that have traditionally grown in the area, as well as removing invasive species such as garlic mustard, purple loosestrife and buckthorn," Foster said. "A few sites are also getting more involved in public education, talking to the volunteers and teaching them environmentally safe practices."

In fact, public education is large-

ly what Rouge Rescue is all about, according to Bob Belair, who is coordinating activities for Canton Township, which is expecting between 250 and 300 volunteers.

"This is a great event. It gets people out there in the environment," he said. "A lot of people who live in high-density population areas like this don't realize its ecological significance. This event gives them a firsthand experience, and lets them know the things they can do to help."

Rescue sites

Here is a list of the River Day/Rouge Rescue sites in the Observer area:

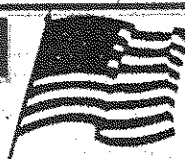

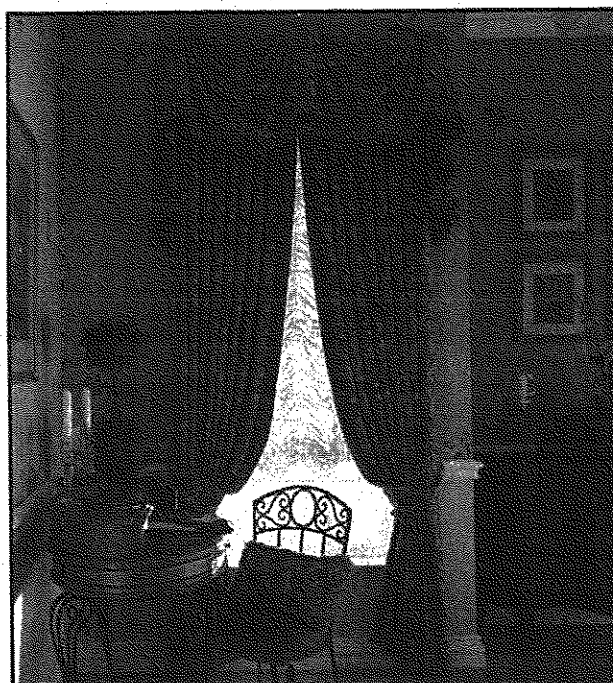

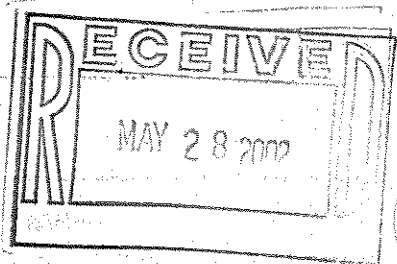

Spanish wines
continue
meteoric rise

Except for California, no other wine-producing area in the world has accelerated as a fine wine source as rapidly as Spain. Like Italy, wine has been made in Spain since Roman times. Until the last decade, much of it was mediocre at best.

Times have changed! Spanish wines are hotter than ever. Another piece of good news is that Spain has had a hot string of very good vintages, beginning with 1999 and extending through the excellent 2001. While that's good news, the flip side is not. Success has brought more Spanish wine brands into the market. Some are not the highest quality and are dulling the image.

This is especially true for albarino, the perfect-for-summer, dry white wine from Rias Baixas, near Galicia in northwest Spain. One of the best available is 2000 Lusco Albarino \$22. Another favorite white of ours, that's great with shellfish, is 2000 Bodegas Angel Rodriguez "Martinsancho" Verdejo \$14 from the Rueda region. This pre-phylloxera, retained in isolation vineyard is responsible for preserving the verdejo variety.

Fruity reds

"Spain as a wine category is maturing," said Steve Metzler, owner of his import company Classical Wines, focused on high quality, family-owned vineyards. "Spain, today, can't be beat for good, globally competitive wines in the \$10 to \$30 range."

Although it's the blockbuster reds (we'll get to those in a minute), that have brought instant fame to Spain, there's a fruity red, that's perfect with spicy foods, you should try. It's also delightful chilled.

2000 Bodegas

Agapito Rico Carchelo from Jumilla \$9 is a blend of monastrell (also known as mourvedre), syrah, tempranillo, cabernet sauvignon and merlot. The fresh berry aromas and flavors of Carchelo are mouthwatering.

Although not as fruity as Carchelo, 2000 Bodegas Guelbenzu "Azul" \$15 from the Navarra region is an incredible value that pleases with layered complexity, mid-weight richness and a long, supple finish.

If you're looking for new and different. Choose the El Bierzo region of northwestern Spain. There, red grapes, grown at high altitude, offer depthful black fruit character. An example is Dominio de Tares Mencia \$17 with a three-month aging in new French oak. The indigenous mencia grape is considered to be a direct ancestor of cabernet franc, a wine that's getting significant play as a solo varietal in California.

Blockbuster reds

The Catalan Priorato region in the mountains southwest of Barcelona is the source of the "killer" wines of Spain. Although hyped by a number of high-profile wine press, there are only a few wines available in the U.S. If you can find them, they run \$200 per bottle. Toro in Castilla y Leon is another red region on the rise.

We prefer to look where some high-profile producers in the Ribera del Duero have recently sunk roots for red wines at more reasonable prices. The most prominent among them is Alejandro Fernandez, acknowledged

Spain does not produce zinfandel. That's a California specialty. The 2000 Zabaco Dancing Bull Zinfandel \$8 is an outstanding value.

Spain doesn't produce sauvignon blanc. It's becoming a New Zealand specialty. Try: 2001 Villa Maria Reserve Clifford Bay \$29 (gooseberry, and grassy style); 2001 Villa Maria Celler Selection \$22 (citrusy and bright); 2001 Villa Maria Private Bin \$15 (refreshing); or 2001 Glazebrook, Hawkes Bay \$12 (good deal).

indoors, is appropriately titled "Screaming Fire-Alarm Lasagna." With a half-cup crushed red pepper it's spicy enough to make any day seem hot.

"Serve with (material safety data sheets) and plenty of Maalox," joked Bushofsky.

For the fat-content counter or the vegetarian in your life, try grilled imitation sausage. Boca brand makes a line of soy-based meat substitutes including ground beef and sausage. Add honey Dijon mustard, chives and mayonnaise to grilled sausage. Substitute ground beef with Boca in Bushofsky's lasagna too, if desired.

A different table setting

Jim Hanson, home design and entertaining expert for Marshall Field's, suggests creating an indoor look at an outdoor picnic. Bring out an oriental rug, cushions and lots of candles for the picnic table. Fill mason jars, baskets and clay pots with annuals, cut greens, branches and fruit. Wrap old plastic pots in burlap and tie with raffia for the centerpieces.

"Set up a grill-to-order station," Hanson suggests. "It gives guests options and the host the opportunity to cook and mingle."

New grill laws

If you're filling the gas grill this year remember that as of April 1, all propane cylinders must have an over-fill prevention device. If not, they will not be refilled.

The OPD prevents cylinders from filling over the 80 percent limit — making them more environmentally

Pig roast's historical roots go whole hog

The longer I live in Michigan, the more I realize that spring weather is something to celebrate. Most of the year is gray and dismal, but, the spring and summer is absolutely wonderful and something to indulge in.

My family's idea of welcoming spring is with our annual pig roast barbecue. The history of barbecue itself is interesting.

The pig became an omnipresent food staple in the south for several reasons. In the pre-Civil War period, southerners ate, on average, 5 pounds of pork for every one pound of beef. Pigs were a

low-maintenance and convenient food source for southerners.

Pigs could be put out to root in the forest and caught when food supplies became low. These semi-wild pigs were tougher and less juicy than modern hogs, but were still a popular food source.

Tenderness of these pigs was achieved by indirect cooking methods involving the use of long, low heat. Every part of the pig was utilized—the meat was either eaten immediately or cured for later consumption, and the ears, organs and other parts were transformed into other edible delicacies.

Pig slaughtering became a time for celebration, and the neighborhood would be invited to share in the event.

Add flavor to pig roast with barbecue sauce

This is a terrific barbecue sauce for roasting the pig. Simply add more chili powder for a spicier sauce.

FAT BOY'S BBQ SAUCE

- 1 cup ketchup
- 1 cup strong black coffee
- ¾ cup apple cider vinegar

- 1 small onion, finely diced
- 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 3 tablespoons brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons molasses
- 2 teaspoons dry mustard
- 1 teaspoon chili powder

Combine all ingredients in saucepan and simmer for 20 minutes.

The traditional southern barbecue grew out of these gatherings.

At the end of the colonial period, the practice of holding smaller neighborhood barbecues was well established, but it was in the fifty years before the

Civil War that the traditions associated with large barbecues became commonplace. Plantation owners regularly held large and festive barbecues, or "pig pickins."

In the nineteenth century, barbecue was a feature at church picnics and political rallies as well as at private parties. A barbecue was a popular and relatively inexpensive way to lobby for votes, and the organizers of political rallies would provide barbecue, lemonade, and usually a bit of whiskey and beer.

These gatherings were also an easy way for different classes to mix. Barbecue was not a class-specific food, and large groups of

people from every socioeconomic class could mix to eat, drink and listen to candidate speeches.

Political and church barbecues were among the first examples of the phenomenon of a barbecue as a means of bringing people together. Church barbecues, where roasted pig supplemented the covered dishes prepared by the ladies of the congregation, were a manifestation of the traditional church picnic in many southern communities. Church

and political barbecues are still a vital tradition in many parts of the South.

At the beginning of the twentieth century, barbecue appeared in a new venue, the barbecue restaurant.

Shortly after, many areas of the South went from a rural-agricultural region to a more urban and industrial area, and grocery stores provided hog meat (is it any wonder that the nation's first supermarket chain

was christened Piggly Wiggly?) already prepared for consumption.

The pre-cut pork reduced the actual number of whole hog roastings, and subsequently, the number of barbecues held as gatherings began to decline.

Today, whole hog roasting is a unique way to gather friends, families and neighbors to celebrate birthdays, family reunions and graduations.

It is relatively easy with the right equipment and will make for lasting memories of your gathering you will cherish for a lifetime. Just don't forget the beer!

Speaking of beer, here are suggestions for selecting the perfect beer to accompany your barbecued pig.

Since pork is a light meat, and it's given a smoky taste when cooked on the roaster, you can choose your favorite beer, from light pilsners through ambers into Irish Reds.

For a basic spicy barbecue, the best choices are a red or amber beer. For the spiciest barbecue,

It's among recipes in Better Homes and Gardens Make-Ahead Cooking (Meredith, \$24.95), a trove of ideas worked out to make the cook's life easier when catering for guests. Some of the angles covered: leftover creations, bonus batches, overnight marinades, stress-free holiday meals, casual entertaining, and simple sweets.

SALMON PINWHEEL SALAD
(Preparation 20 minutes, cooking 6 minutes, chilling time 2 hours)

one 1 1/2-pound fresh or frozen skinless salmon fillet, 1/2 to 1 inch thick
1/2 cup dry white wine or water
1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

1 bay leaf

10-ounce package European-style torn mixed salad greens

2 medium oranges, peeled and sectioned

1 cup thinly sliced cucumber

1/4 cup sliced almonds, toasted
1 recipe Fresh Orange Dressing (recipe follows)

Thaw salmon, if frozen. Cut salmon fillet lengthwise into 6 even strips. Lightly season with salt and pepper. Starting with the thick end of each strip, roll into pinwheels. Secure each pinwheel with a wooden toothpick or wooden skewer.

In a large skillet combine white wine or water, the 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, and bay leaf; bring to boiling. Add salmon. Return to boiling; reduce heat.

Cover and simmer for 6 to 8 minutes or until fish just flakes easily when tested with a fork; turn once.

Using a slotted spoon, remove salmon from cooking liquid. Discard cooking liquid. Cover and chill salmon in refrigerator at least 2 hours (or for up to 24 hours).

To serve, arrange salad greens, orange sections, cucumber slices and almonds on salad plates or in salad bowls. Top each salad with a salmon pinwheel. Spoon Fresh Orange Dressing over salads. Makes 6 servings.

FRESH ORANGE DRESSING

1/2 cup light dairy sour cream
1/2 teaspoon finely shredded orange peel
2 tablespoons orange juice
2 teaspoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon poppy seed
additional orange juice as needed

In a small bowl stir first five ingredients together, adding additional juice, 1 teaspoon at a time, until desired consistency. Makes about 1/2 cup.

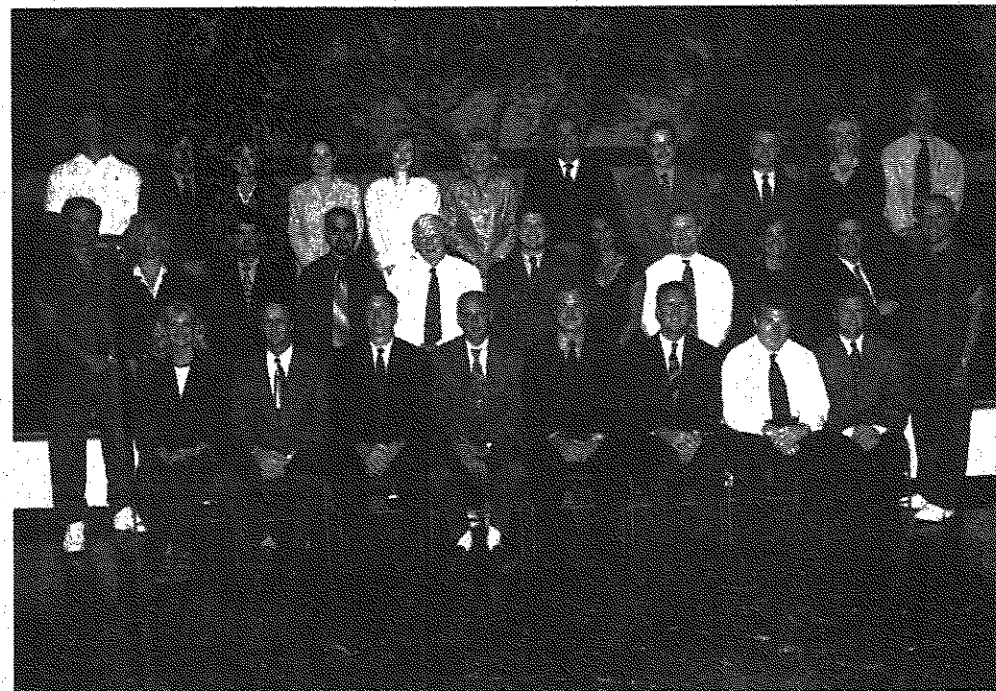

Like gold

Wild morel mushrooms a delicious rite of spring

I have found that most people don't understand the difference between true wild mushrooms and exotic mushrooms. This may be because some restaurants use "exotic mushrooms" and bill them as "wild." However exotic mushrooms like shiitake, enoki and

portobello, are grown domestically. Wild mushrooms, on the other hand, are very difficult to cultivate and of the edible wild mushrooms, morels are the most sought after in Michigan.

For a few weeks in May, when Michigan has thawed and started to warm, these unusual and arguably best tasting mushrooms spring into life. According to Ernest Hemingway, "the morel is king in Boyne Valley" and mushroom hunters, gatherers and enthusiasts come out from their winter hibernation to hunt the elusive fungi.

There seems to be quite a frenzy about the unique morel and I have had several conversations in the past few weeks with people of all walks of life about these tender delicacies. One friend, whose family has an apple orchard, mentioned that her uncle is lucky enough to gather morels secretly by some of his apple trees where the apples have fallen and rotted.

Another friend, who happens to be a chef, has scheduled time off from the restaurant that he and his wife own to be part of Michigan's Morel Festival in the upper part of the state. I don't know if they will participate in the mushroom hunting competitions, where gatherers retreat into remote areas and search the woods. I do know that they will stop at each morel stand to sample new recipes.

At the Golden Mushroom, we

MOREL MUSHROOMS WITH COGNAC AND CREAM

A recipe of The Golden Mushroom
Serves 2

- 8 ounces fresh morel mushrooms
 - 3 ounces whole unsalted butter
 - 1 teaspoon finely minced shallots
 - 1 cup heavy cream
 - 2 ounces good cognac, or a good brandy
 - 1 tablespoon sliced chives salt to taste
- 1) Heat a saute pan or skillet on high heat until the pan is hot, then turn down to medium heat.
 - 2) Add fresh morels and half of the whole butter and cook for a minute or so. Adjust the heat if needed.
 - 3) Now add shallots and cook until translucent. Be sure to stir constantly to prevent the shallots from sticking.
 - 4) Add cognac and reduce until dry then add cream and reduce this until thick and it clings to the morels.
 - 5) Season with salt and pepper to taste and fold in the remainder of the whole butter. Taste and adjust seasoning if needed.
 - 6) Sprinkle with sliced chives.

have a long history with morel mushrooms. It all started with Master Chef Milos Cihelka, about 20 years ago. Being of European descent, Chef grew up foraging for wild mushrooms. Michigan was an attractive state to him because many of our natural resources are similar to Europe's. Even though this commonality is true, at the time most Michigan restaurants did not serve morel mushrooms. He introduced the morel to the Golden Mushroom

table and they were an immediate favorite. Today, if you are willing to pay the hefty price of \$20 a pound or more, you can purchase morels at specialty produce stores.

One of our finest dishes is Morels in Cognac and Cream. This is an old European recipe and we try to keep this popular feature on the menu all year.

By doing so we have to buy a couple thousand pounds of morels annually. No light order when you consider the prices.

Since mushrooms have such a short shelf life, we cut them in half to inspect for bugs or dirt because they do grow naturally in the wild. Then we drop them in cold water, swish them around for a second and quickly pull them out with a strainer and shake.

"What?" You say, "you are not supposed to soak mushrooms!" I did not say soak them, rather I said, rinse them. This is assuming of course that you don't enjoy the taste of dirt and bugs. Since the mushrooms are like sponges, the key is to do this process quickly or their texture will be harmed.

If you would like to hunt for mushrooms, it is my suggestion to buy a good mushroom book. *The Ultimate Mushroom Book* by Peter Jordan and Steven Wheeler is a good choice. It has clear pictures, lists what mushrooms might be poisonous and where and when you might find what you are looking for.

So, happy morel hunting or shopping!

MORE MEMORIAL RECIPES

GRILLED MEATLESS SAUSAGE WITH HERB MUSTARD

- ¾ cup light mayonnaise or Veganaise dairy-less dressing
 - 2 tablespoons honey Dijon mustard
 - 1 teaspoon minced fresh chives or dill
 - 1 package (10 ounces) frozen Boca brand meatless smoked sausage (imitation soy-based sausage found at most supermarkets)
 - 4 hot dog buns, split
 - leafy lettuce
 - tomato
- Mix Mayo, mustard and chives and refrigerate. Grill sausages as directed on package (just several minutes required). Serve on buns with lettuce, tomato and mustard sauce. Serves four. Sauce can be prepared ahead and covered in refrigerator for three days.

THREE BERRY FROZEN TOFU CUSTARD

- 3 cups aseptically packaged silken tofu
- ¾ cup fresh or frozen, thawed blueberries
- ¾ cup fresh or frozen, thawed strawberries
- 2 tablespoons sugar or to taste

½ teaspoon vanilla extract

Place all ingredients in blender or food processor. Process until smooth and blended. Pour into 1-quart bowl or individual dessert cups. Freeze at least 2 hours, stirring once after one hour. Serve frozen. Makes about 3½ cups or seven ½ cups servings.

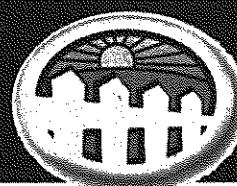
SUMMERTIME FRUIT DIP

- 1 cup aseptically packaged silken tofu
- ¾ cup aseptically packaged soy creamer
- 2 ripe bananas
- ½ cup fresh or frozen thawed berries
- 2 tablespoon aseptically packaged orange juice
- ½ teaspoon vanilla extract

Place tofu, creamer, bananas and berries in a blender or food processor and process until smooth. Add orange juice and vanilla and mix only until combined. Chill for at least one hour prior to serving. Use as a dipping sauce for fruit or sweet crackers as a dressing for fruit salad or melon cubes, as a cake topping or as a topping for baked or grilled sweet potatoes. Yield 2 cups.

Fernandez 1999 Condado de Haza \$24 from an estate vineyard he planted in the Ribera del Duero in 1987 is also excellent, brimming with ripe black fruits and a dark chocolate-like finish.

In 1998, Fernandez purchased his third estate Dehesa la Granja along the Duero River near Zamora. At \$21, the 1998 Dehesa la Granja from Fernandez is an incredible glass of wine.

Fernandez scoured the region of La Mancha in search of more vineyards with potential for growing high-quality tempranillo. His newest wine 2000 Fernandez El Vinculo from La Man-

cha \$24 is designed for lovers of new oak character, balanced by blackberry fruit and brown spices. Really delicious!

German rail dining cars to be history

(AP) - Germany's national railroad has reported a slight rise in passenger traffic for 2001 and pledged to push ahead with cost cuts that include the phaseout of a classic train fixture - the dining car.

Deutsche Bahn said it swung to a net loss of 204 million euros (\$186 million) last year because of investments in modernization, even as sales rose 1.7 percent. The result, which confirmed preliminary figures released in March, compared with a 199 million euro

profit in 2000.

Still, chief executive Hartmut Mehdorn said he was optimistic that the sprawling railroad's efficiency drive would achieve its goal of making the company fit for possible privatization in the next few years.

"We are satisfied with the 2001 business year," Mehdorn said. "Now we have to continue along this path in the next few years."

Eliminating the time-honored dining car is one way the company hopes to save money.

Deutsche Bahn said this week the phaseout will begin Aug. 1 in its latest-generation InterCityExpress trains and gradually extend to all express trains next year. Restaurant-style seats and tables will be replaced by a snack bar, and food trolleys will serve passengers at their seats.

Rail officials said only 15 percent of passengers currently order food - because they are reluctant to leave their seats and luggage and because eating habits are shifting toward lighter fare.

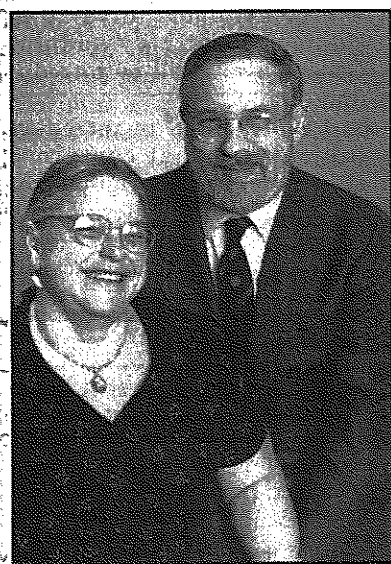

Give your landscape photos a center of interest

FOCUS ON PHOTOGRAPHY

With many subjects, the image consists primarily of a subject and a background, and the technique of composition is creating a satisfactory balance between them.

With landscape the image is not so readily defined and more attention must be paid to color, tone, and texture and the creation of harmony within these elements.

As with most photographs, a successful landscape picture should have an identifiable center of attention supported by the other elements in the composition.

This center of interest could be something quite obvious, such as, a certain area of pattern or texture or a color that stands out from the rest. Placing the emphasis on one area of the pic-

ture gives structure to your composition and helps guide the viewer's eye, which might otherwise wander about looking for something to settle on.

Pay attention to the horizon line. A low horizon is used when you want to emphasize a dramatic sky and give a feeling of spaciousness to your shot.

A high horizon will draw attention toward the foreground and will minimize an uninteresting sky.

Can you ever place the horizon in the center of the viewfinder? Yes, if the image has an overall symmetrical quality that you want to emphasize.

Often, lighting is the single most important element in a landscape picture. Be on the lookout for fog and mist that will add a romantic quality to your shot.

Sunbeams breaking through storm clouds are easily captured on film and will add exciting impact to your landscapes.

Time of day will have a dramatic effect on a landscape image. Try to shoot in early

morning or late afternoon when shadows are enhanced and texture and form are accentuated.

If you do, your shot will be much more exciting than if you had shot under a noontime sun.

Become aware of color changes during the course of the day. Light quality has more red content early morning and late afternoon producing warmer, more mellow pictures than those taken at noon.


Perhaps a good trick in landscape photography is to imagine the landscape you see through your viewfinder as a vast tabletop still life and the sun as your spotlight.

The idea is to "place" your spotlight in the best location and "arrange" the elements you see in the best possible way to make a photograph with impact-one that produces a harmonious balance out of nature.

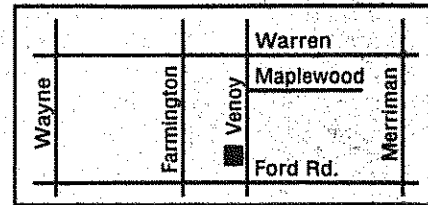

100th birthday

Island's Chippewa Hotel celebrates milestone

The newly renovated Chippewa Hotel on Mackinac Island is celebrating its 100th anniversary this year.

"I think we're the only hotel with walk-out balconies from the new suites," said Robert Benser of Birmingham who owns the hotel with Frank Nephew. "Also, we constructed a whirlpool that overlooks the harbor. Families and kids seem to be enjoying it."

Located on Main Street, at the water's edge, the Chippewa, which also houses the Turtle Club Deck and famed Pink Pony Bar and Grill, is within walking distance of ferry docks, the marina, carriage tours, shops and historic attractions.

"We have a newly renovated deck which is perfect for receptions and parties," Benser said. "We enlarged the Pink Pony. It's about twice as big and now has a partial water view." The deck holds up to 80 people and is available seven days a week for parties of all occasions.

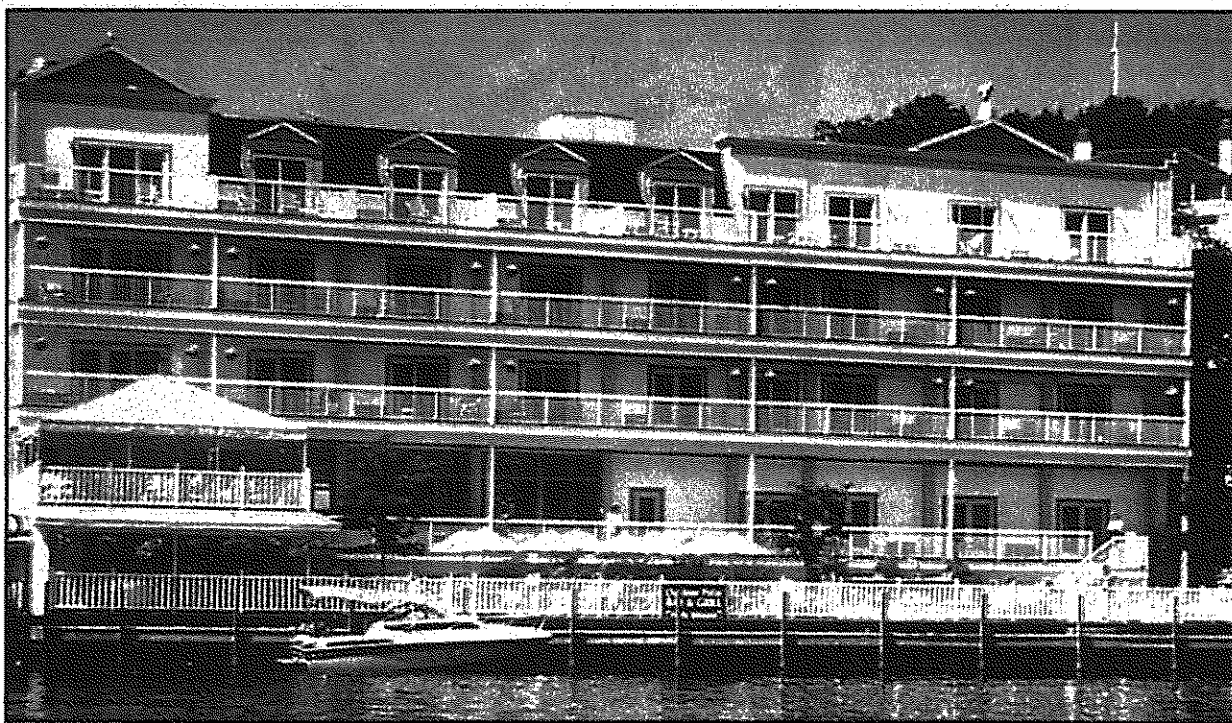
The hotel also offers sailing trips in a 50-foot catamaran sailboat for the guests which lately, the owner says, is becoming more popular. "Everybody enjoys it," Benser said. "It's just a nice tour of the island."

Benser estimates the hotel probably takes in 20,000 guests per season, during the spring and fall.

"Some of the best times to come up are in the off season," he said. "A lot of people don't always know that."

History

Built in 1902, the Chippewa was originally owned by George T. Arnold of the Arnold Transit Company. Arnold then sold it to fur trader John Jacob Astor. Nathan Shayne bought the hotel in 1946, and added the Pink Pony Bar and Grill. Benser and Nephew took over management of the hotel in 1984. They spent



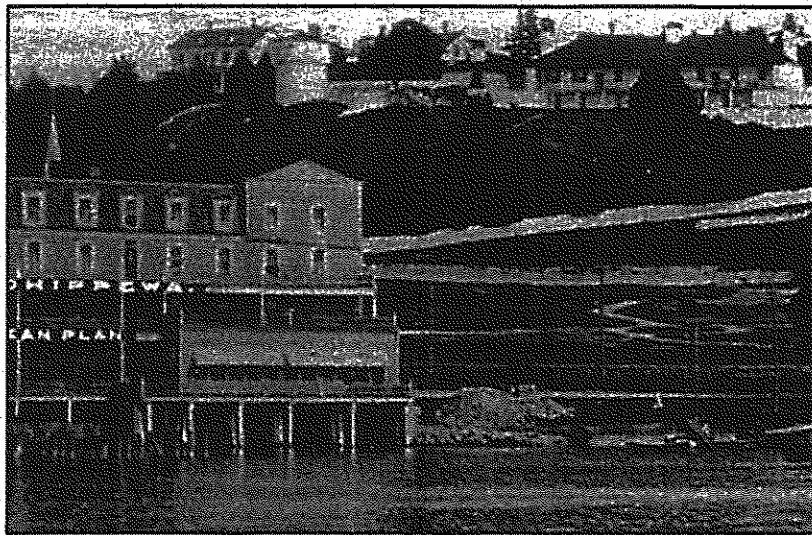
Summer destination: Newly remodeled, the Chippewa Hotel has been serving guests for 100 years on Mackinac Island.

approximately \$4 million renovating it in 1995 to create a more accommodating atmosphere for guests.

Their lobby is decorated in turn-of-the-century Victorian style, with a maroon, green and beige floral motif. Brand new ceiling fans, large chairs and couches in the lobby create an "at home" feeling for guests. Hotel rooms are individually decorated with wool, floral carpeting in various colors which reflect Victorian theme. Standard rooms, kept in their original Victorian state, overlook Main Street, while suites offer a view of the harbor. Decks also gives guests a panoramic view of one of the most famous lighthouses in area, Round Island Light-house.

Guests can also let loose and

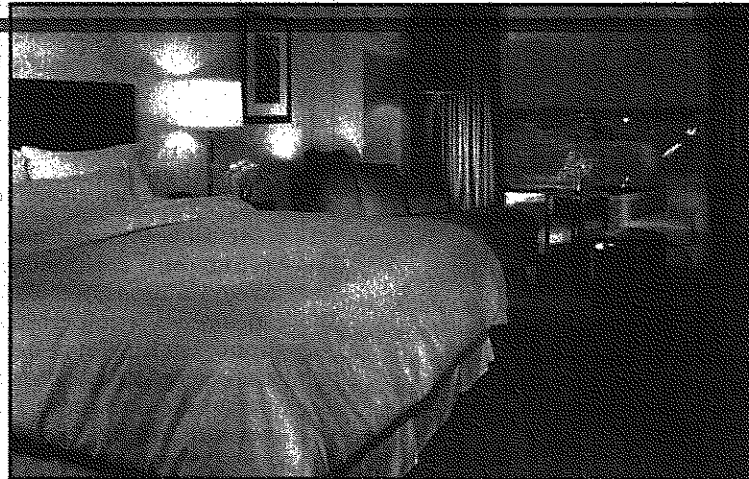


Historic photo: This is what the Chippewa Hotel looked like 100 years ago.

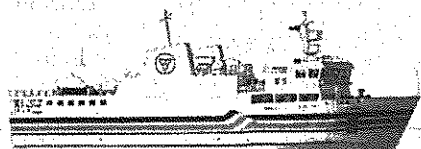

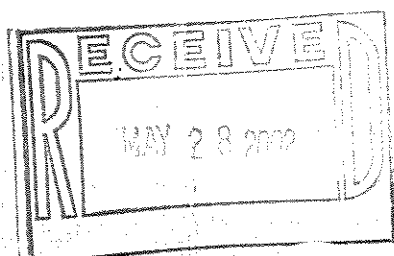

Demsick steps down

After years of struggle, the Plymouth Canton wrestling program was rejuvenated when John Demsick took control as head coach four years ago. It had been a dozen years since the Chiefs had last won a tournament trophy before Demsick's arrival; now, they get a half-dozen or more a season.

Now 49, Demsick has decided to step aside after four seasons as Canton's coach.

"It's always so hard to leave," he said. "I still feel a real excitement for the younger wrestlers coming up at Canton, but I've thought about it every day over the last year and it's time for me to go."

Demsick cited health reasons and a wish to spend more time with his family as the main reasons for his departure. Also, three of his four sons — all of whom wrestled for him — are now in college.

In his four seasons as Canton's coach, Demsick guided the Chiefs to 21 tournament trophies and a 56-19 dual-meet record.

Although he won't be coach Canton, Demsick will still be involved in wrestling. An elementary school physical education teacher in the Plymouth-Canton district, Demsick said he plans to "spend more time than previous years teaching wrestling clinics for middle school and elementary students. We've needed more of a feeder program and I hope it helps all three high schools."

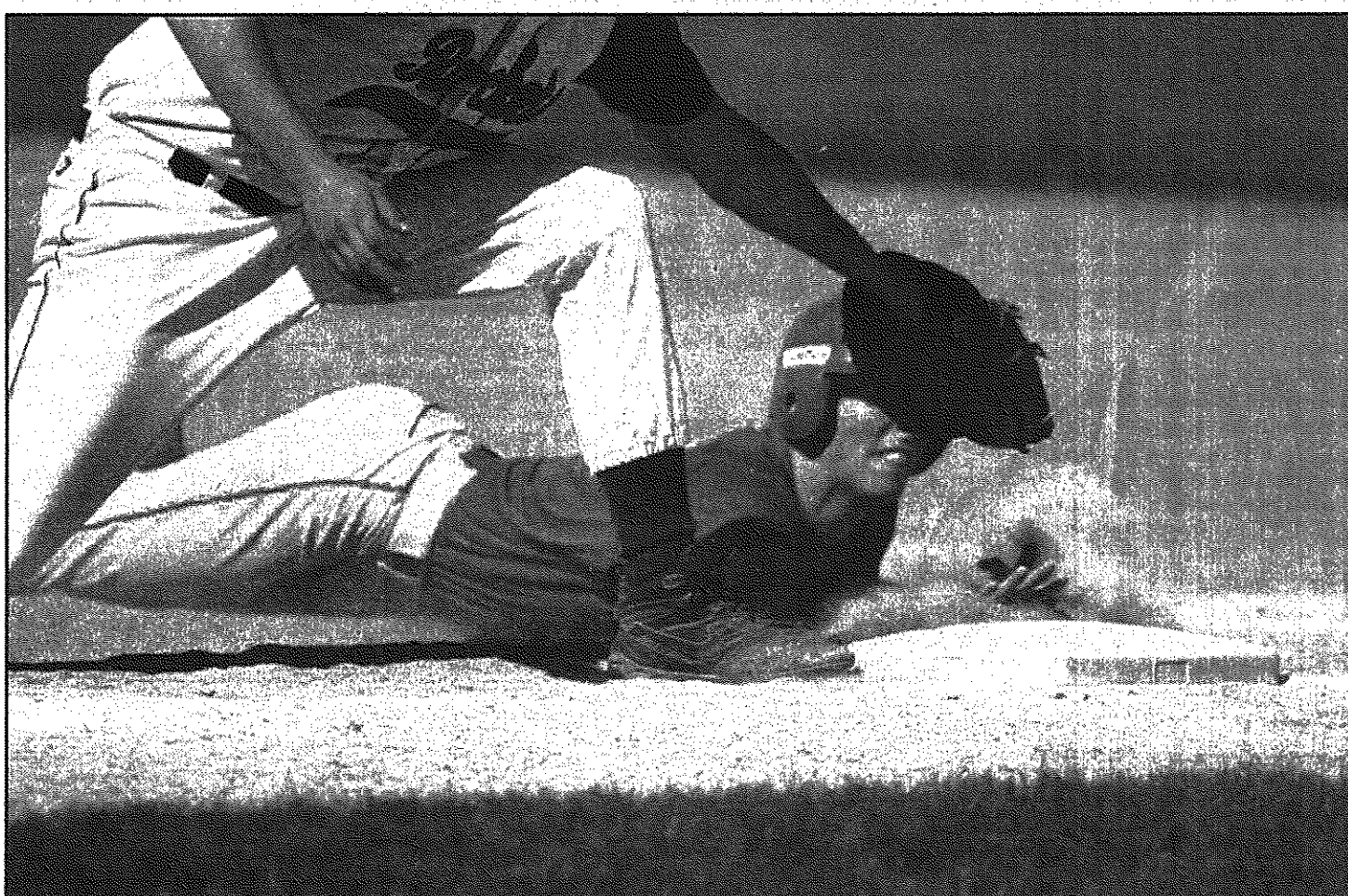

Howald had three hits in the game, driving in three runs. Matt Staley added two hits, scoring two runs and driving in two more; Mike Tomasaitis had two hits and an RBI; and Nick Musselman and Chris Pirch each had two hits.

Kyle Rutkowski went 4-for-4 to lead the Rocket hitters; Brandon Ajlouny added three hits for Glenn.

Carl McDevitt started on the mound for Canton, working the first six innings and surrendering three earned

Lady Ocelots seeking to replace losses

There's a lot to replace on a team that won 26 of 31 games last season, and Schoolcraft College women's basketball coach Karen Lafata hasn't wasted any time in doing it.

First, though, comes one of those who's leaving: Devin Francois, a 5-foot-10 forward from Ypsilanti who led the Lady Ocelots in both scoring; averaging

14 points a game, and rebounding, with 11.4 a game.

Francois will take her talents to Oakland University, an NCAA Division I program.

"They want her to step in right away and score and rebound," said Lafata, who guided SC to two consecutive Michigan Community College Athletic

Association Eastern Conference titles and its first-ever state championship last season. "They like her size and ability to inside and outside."

Francois joins SC teammate Rachel Eley in extending her collegiate playing career. Eley, a 5-3 NJCAA All-American point guard from Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher, signed with Life University, an NAIA college located in Marietta, Ga.

Those are two of eight sophomores on

last season's SC team, which means Lafata has a lot of holes to fill. And she's well underway in managing it.

"We lose an All-American in the backcourt, so you figure we lose a lot," Lafata said. "We only bring three players back."

Lafata announced the signing of five players to help offset the losses. Four of the new recruits are backcourt players.

At point guard, Lafata is bringing in

Late goal carries Stevenson to WLAA title

It's not often two coaches agree, but following the Western Lakes Activities Association girls soccer championship game, played Wednesday at Livonia Stevenson, there was such an occurrence.

The team that dominated play most of the game, the team that had more and better scoring chances, did not win.

The victory — and the WLAA title — went to Stevenson, which got a goal from Melissa Dobbyn with just 4:47 left in the match to edge previously-unbeaten Northville 1-0.

There was a lot of satisfaction for the Spartans attached to this victory. It ended a four-game losing streak they had endured against the Mustangs, something that's akin to blasphemy for a school as steeped in soccer tradition as Stevenson is.

It also allowed the Spartans (now 11-5-1) to recapture the WLAA championship outright, something that had eluded them the past two seasons. Last year Northville beat them in the final; the year before, they tied Plymouth Canton.

"We dominated 90 percent of the game," said Northville coach Ron Meteyer. "We just couldn't put the ball in the net. That happens sometimes."

Stevenson coach Chris Pinta couldn't argue. "They outplayed us," he admitted. "We definitely stole it at the end. But that's sports — it happens sometimes."

Actually, there were two plays that decided the match. The first came with 23:12 remaining in the second half. Stevenson had started the game strongly, dominating the first 10 minutes and twice knocking shots off the crossbar beyond Northville keeper Katharine Koch, and a penalty kick was immediately awarded.

Ossola lined up to take the kick, aiming her shot to Koch's right — which is where Koch correctly guessed the shot would be placed. She made the diving save, preserving the scoreless tie.

"That turned the game around for us," said Pinta. "Definitely."

Kneisel attempted to beat Dobbyn to the ball, but the sophomore forward pushed the ball past the Northville keeper and then buried it into the open net for the game's only goal.

"They tried an offside trap," said Meteyer of his defenders. "They got away with it a few times, but they weren't supposed to do that then. We're going to have to make some adjustments on that."

After the goal, the Mustangs continued to apply pressure — to no avail. "We've gone through stretches like that," said Pinta of Northville's goalless efforts. "But this is big for us, handing them their first loss this year."

The two teams could meet again in the regionals, with a lot more at stake. So stay tuned.

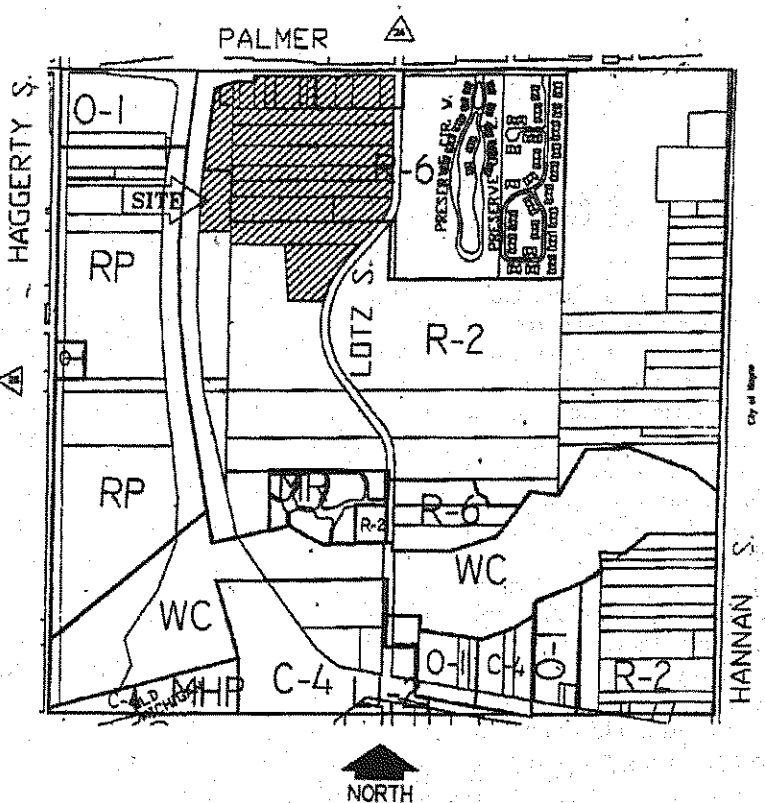

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 1, GENERAL PROVISIONS SECTION 1-13, GENERAL PENALTY, PARAGRAPH (a)(5) AND ARTICLE VII, PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE, OF CHAPTER 18 BUILDING REGULATIONS OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH AND REPLACE WITH NEW SECTION 1-13 PARAGRAPH (A)(5) AND ARTICLE VII, OF CHAPTER 18, BUILDING REGULATIONS.

THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH ORDAINS:

Section 1. Chapter 1 Section 13, paragraph, (a) (5) General penalties and sanctions for violations of Code and city ordinances; continuing violations; injunctive relief. If hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefore:

(5) Sections 18-211, et seq., being the International Property Maintenance Code, 2000, and any amendments thereto and Supplemental Standards.

Section 2. Chapter 18, Article VII is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefore:

ARTICLE VII PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE

DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

Section 18-211. Adoption of Property Maintenance Code By Reference
That a certain document, three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the Building Official of the City of Plymouth being marked and designated as "The International Property Maintenance Code, 2000" as published by The International Code Council, Inc. be and is hereby adopted as the Property Maintenance Code of the City of Plymouth in the State of Michigan; for the control of buildings and structures as herein provided; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said International Property Maintenance Code, are hereby referred to, adopted and made part hereof as if fully set out in this Ordinance, with the addition, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 18-212 of this Ordinance.

Section 18-212. National Property Maintenance Code, Additions, Insertions and occupants

Sec. 18-227. Intent, conflicts.
The intent of this division is to provide minimum standards for the maintenance of buildings and premises. Nothing in this division shall be deemed to supersede, modify or reduce the requirements of other city ordinances, codes and regulations. All other ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this division shall be controlling to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Sec. 18-228. Definitions.
The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this division, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Building means any structure occupied or intended for the purpose of supporting or sheltering any occupancy.

Inoperable Vehicle means any motor vehicle such as an automobile, truck, motorcycle, boat, personal watercraft, snowmobile, all-terrain vehicle, equipment or trailer, that meet any of the following conditions: without an operable engine, unable to be started, one or more missing or flat tires, are not currently licensed so as to be lawfully operated on public streets, or are otherwise in a state of disrepair that they cannot be lawfully operated on public streets.

Premises means a lot or parcel of land including the buildings and structures.

Structure means that which is built or constructed, or any portion thereof.

Workmanlike manner means the manner of carrying out such activities as construction, maintenance and repair such as to secure the adequate maintenance of buildings and premises, to sustain the property rights of adjacent owners, and to eliminate conditions which contribute to fire, safety, and health hazards.

Yard means an open space on the same lot with a building, which space is unoccupied and unobstructed from the ground upward, except as otherwise provided herein. The measurement of the yard is the minimum horizontal distance between the lot line and the building or structure.

(1) Front yard means a yard extending the full width of lot, the depth of which is the minimum horizontal distance between the front lot line and the nearest line to the principal building on the lot.

(2) Rear yard means a yard extending the full width of the lot, the depth of which is the horizontal distance between the rear lot line and the rear line or lines of the principal building on the lot.

Sec. 18-230. Standards for maintenance of premises.
The same to be published as required by law; and this Ordinance shall take full force and effect Twenty-one (21) days after the date of final passage and approval.

Falls present a significant threat to senior citizens

For senior citizens, a fall can mark the end of independence. Hip fractures, the most common trauma of a fall, often result in hospital stays of two or more weeks. Sadly, half of all older adults hospitalized for hip fractures never return home or live independently after their injuries.

"Falling is one of the leading causes of death among seniors," said Gary P. Jacobson, director of Henry Ford Hospital's Risk of Falls Clinic in Detroit. "And with the population aging, the problem will become progressively worse."

According to Jacobson, 20 percent of elderly in this country who

sustain a hip fracture from a fall will die within a year; another 20 percent will be moved to an inpatient long-term care center; and of those who sustain hip fractures, 49 percent will die within six months.

And in a country that equates health care with dollars, the cost of caring for seniors injured from falls is estimated at close to \$20 billion.

The Risk of Falls Clinic is part of the Henry Ford Hospital's Department of Otolaryngology. It is believed to be the first clinic of its kind in metro Detroit that offers patients a comprehensive assessment of risks associated with falling, from specific diseases or conditions such as Parkinson's

Disease, osteoporosis and depression to balance impairment, vision problems and the cumulative effect of multiple medications.

There's been a tremendous amount of research about the risks of falling, said Jacobson. However, coordinating and applying this research in a clinical setting is new. "There is beginning to be a greater awareness of falls being more than accidental. But we've been looking at it nearsightedly instead of being multi-focused."

Society's myopia may be changing. Since the clinic's inception last fall, over 50 patients have been evaluated. Their average age is 75, and most of them are women.

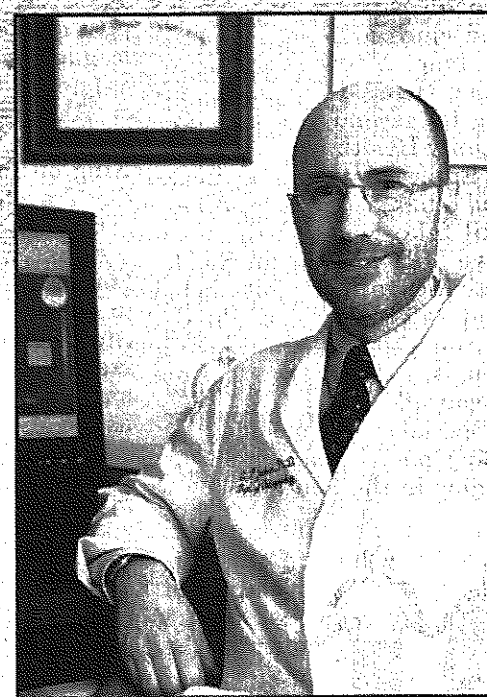
Risk factors

Jacobson sees two classes of patients in the Risk of Falls Clinic: Those who have a fear of falling or who previously have been evaluated for risk of falling and those who have already experienced a fall. The latter class is most at risk for falling again, according to American Academy of Family Physicians.

Jacobson and his colleagues administer a battery of outpatient tests over two days to evaluate a patient for risks. Their assessment includes the following:

■ History - This includes previous falls, medication use, gait problems or weaknesses, dizziness/vertigo/loss of consciousness, major illnesses and problems in the home environment, such as loose throw rugs, improper lighting and lack of safety bars.

■ Cognitive - Is the patient aware of his immediate environment? Does she forget to hold onto the handrail while walking down

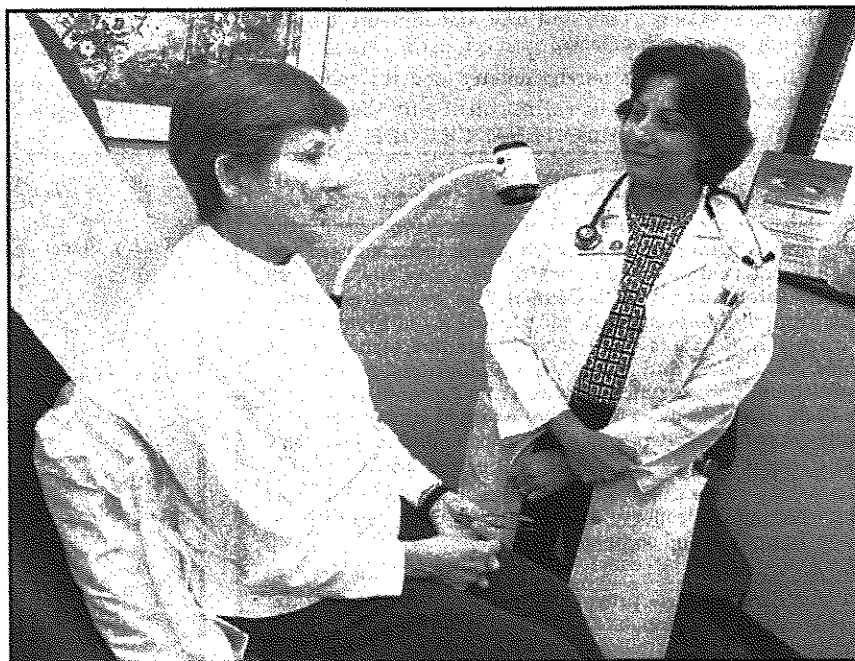
■ Maintain a regular exercise program. Exercise improves strength, balance and coordination.

■ Take steps to make living areas safer. Remove tripping hazards and use non-slip mats in the bathtub and on shower floors. Have grab bars put in next to the toilet and in the tub or shower. Have handrails put in on both sides of all stairs.

■ Ask their doctor to review all of their medicines in order to reduce side effects and interactions.

■ Have an eye doctor check their vision each year. Poor vision can increase the risk of falling.

Achievement award

U of M doctor receives highest honor in surgery

The American Surgical Association has awarded its Medallion for Scientific Achievement to Dr. Robert Bartlett, professor, general surgery and chief, Division of Critical Care. The award has been given only 16 times in the last 120 years and represents the highest honor in surgery in America. The award was announced at the end of April.

Bartlett was recognized for his contributions in the care of the critically ill patient, and specifically for developing Continuous Hemofiltration for the treatment of kidney failure and Extracorporeal Life Support, commonly known as Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation or ECMO. These techniques use artificial organs (heart, lung and kidney) to sustain the life of critically ill patients while their own injured organs can recover. The tech-

niques developed at the University of Michigan Medical School are now used in intensive care units worldwide, saving the lives of thousands of patients each year.

"Hundreds of people at the U of M deserve credit for this award," Bartlett says. "The U of M provides a unique environment that supports the laboratory and clinical research - and the clinical practice - which makes this type of scientific progress possible."

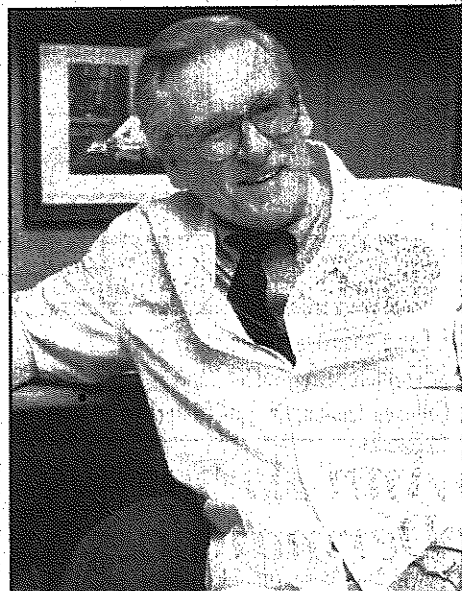
Bartlett's research on artificial

organs in intensive care has been supported by the National Institutes of Health since 1972. The progression from bench laboratory studies to successful clinical practice is now called "translational research." In 1992, the NIH cited the development of ECMO as a prototypic example of how high-tech medicine should be brought from concept to worldwide practice.

ECMO has been used most extensively for newborn infants with respiratory failure. Every major children's hospital has an ECMO program. In the last decade, ECMO has been successfully extended to older children and adults with respiratory and cardiac failure.

Currently the U of M Extracorporeal Life Support team is conducting trials

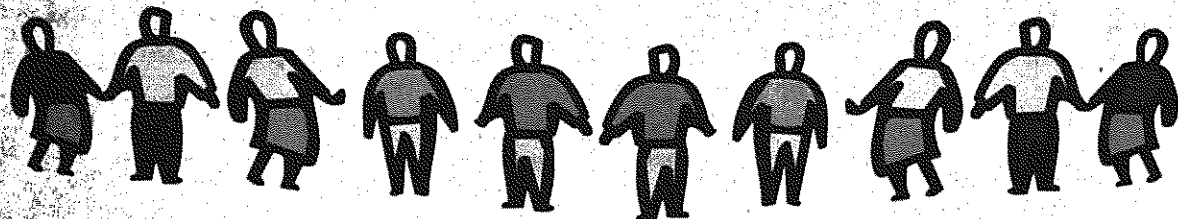

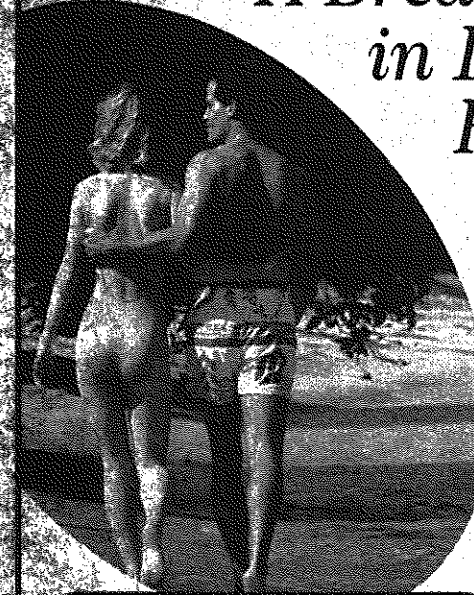

the stairs or to turn on the bedroom light while navigating to the bathroom?

■ **Reaction time** - This hearing test involves listening for a specific tone and then pressing a button. A latency or absence of response may indicate cognitive abilities have declined.

■ **Depression** - Significant clinical depression may make a patient less aware of his environment. Also, some patients on antidepressants may be more sensitive to the medication and experience more side effects.

■ **Postural hypotension** - This occurs when patients occur when patients who have been sitting or laying for extended periods of time stand quickly and begin to walk. They experience dizziness and lightheadedness. "When you stand up, there is a demand for the blood to reach the brain... In extreme cases, patients will pass out," said Jacobson.

The condition is often exaggerated after eating a meal, when the demand for blood to digest food is increased.

■ **Vision** - Diseases that result in visual impairment for the elderly include cataracts, glaucoma and macular degeneration. Predictable visual changes in the elderly include a decline in ability to define edges, such as stairs and sidewalk edges, and slower adaptation to darkness.

■ **Somesthesia** - This term refers to an awareness of bodily sensations, such as touch, pressure, and vibration. People use sensory information related from muscle spindles and joints in the ankles, knees and hips and pressure sensors in the feet

to indicate their rate and direction of movement.

"We have found evidence of impaired somesthesia in 70 percent of our patients," said Jacobson.

Ongoing evaluation

Dr. Bharati Srivastava, a geriatric specialist with St. Joseph Mercy's Senior Health Clinic, Canton, sees only patients age 65 and over. Assessing risks for falling is part of their initial, as well as ongoing, medical evaluation.

"Everyone is asked have you fallen, do you fall on a recurrent basis, or do you have the feeling you will fall, said Srivastava.

She evaluates for eyesight, hearing, blood pressure, physical gait, neurological functions, foot problems (calluses, corns and proper fitting shoes), and number and kinds of medications.

According to the American Academy of Family Physicians, the risk of falling is greater for patients on medication with extended half lives (greater than 24 hours) and increases exponentially with the number of medication used.

"If the elderly are on four or more prescriptions, they fall more," said Srivastava.

Srivastava also does a simple "get up and go" test. She sits her patients in a chair and tells them to get up and walk. If they need help, she wants to know why. Jacobson does the same test in which he determines the time it takes for a patient to rise to standing from an arm chair, walk three meters, turn, walk back to the chair and sit down.

Assessing for risk of falls in

seniors takes time, said Srivastava, often more than just one office visit. Some patients may unknowingly withhold information. For example, even if her patients say their neurological function is fine, Srivastava still does an evaluation for weakness in the legs or on one side, poor reflexes or a tendency to lean on one side. Also, she makes sure her patients who walk with a cane or walker are doing so correctly. Changing the height of a cane or suggesting a walker with wheels often results in smoother and safer ambulation.

Fear of falling is another issue doctors must deal with in assessing a patient's risk factors for falling, said Srivastava.

"Seniors start limiting their activity. They begin to depend on others... They are actually at a higher risk when they have to walk. They're getting more debilitated."

With primary care physicians in this country being charged with so much responsibility - they must be an expert in every sub-specialty as well as a manager of health care costs - St. Joe's Senior Health Clinic and Henry Ford's Risk of Falls Clinic play a more important role in an aging population.

The goal of both clinics is simple: Keep the elderly as independent as possible.

New IRA rules help women close retirement savings gap

Women and men are Venus and Mars not only when it comes to communication styles. They're often worlds apart in the challenges they face to build their retirement nest egg. Thanks to the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001, women now have more opportunities to save for a more comfortable and secure financial future. First let's look at the unique challenges many women face:

Women tend to earn less than men in the workplace, on average about 76 cents for every dollar earned by men. Further curtailing earnings, women often spend long periods out of the workforce to raise children or care for elderly relatives.

Lower pay and less time in the workforce often result in smaller retirement portfolios and lower company pension benefits for women. For the same reasons, women's Social Security benefits may also be lower than those of men.

Even though women typically receive lower pay and benefits, they most likely will need a larger retirement nest egg than men require. That's because women generally live longer

than men and must finance more years in retirement.

Although married women may share their husbands' savings, those assets may be quickly depleted if he becomes ill and dies first, which, considering life expectancy, is often the case.

is good news for women whose saving plans may have fallen behind because of time out of the workforce raising children or providing other caregiving. People 50 years and older are now able to contribute an additional \$500 per year to their IRA beginning this tax year through 2005, and up to \$1,000 for 2006 and later.

Greater portability of retirement savings. The recent tax law changes have also increased the portability of retirement savings. This is particularly important for women who have changed jobs, taken time off to raise a family or inherited retirement accounts from a husband or parents.

Portability means you can move or roll over your assets or a deceased spouse's assets from former employer retirement plans into an IRA and consolidate them into one account. By consolidating your retirement savings into one account, investing, monitoring and

rebalancing your retirement funds should be quicker and easier. And if you consolidate your funds at a financial services firm, you may also have a wider choice of retirement investments and a relationship with a financial advisor who can provide planning and support.

Private courtyards included with condos

Charleston Club Condominiums in Troy is a smallish community with only 12 residences coupled together in six buildings.

Yet each home has a private courtyard and there's plenty of grassy spaces in the development off Long Lake Road between Crooks and Livernois.

"Everything is quality," she said. "They like the layout, like the openness. Another thing they like is a lot of green around. They're not all squeezed in."

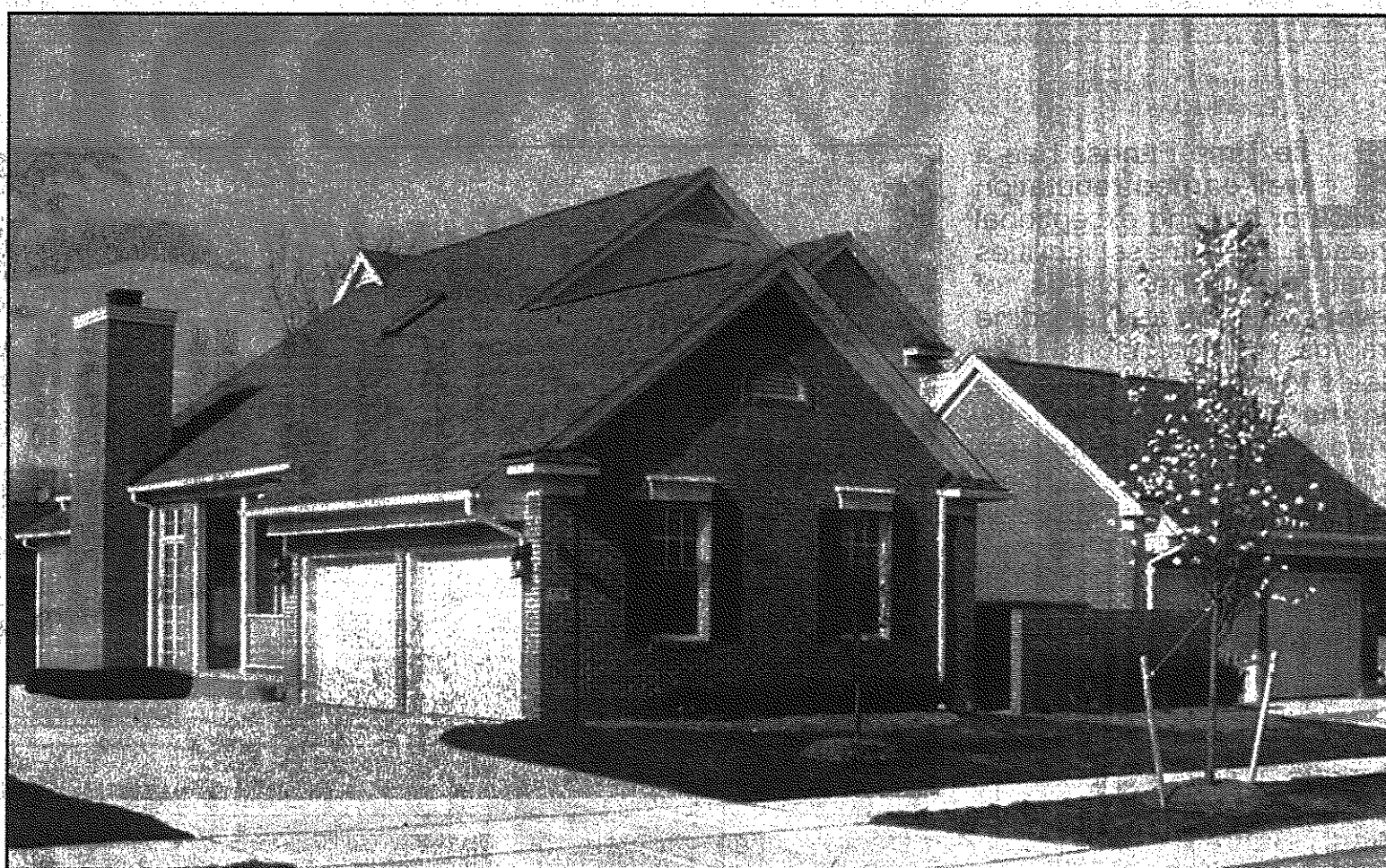
So far, empty nesters seem especially attracted to Charleston Club.
