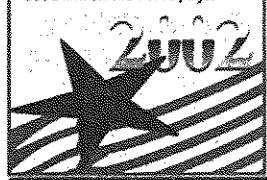

# Campaign sign battle is raging

They are campaign currency in western Wayne County and the subject of controversy every election. Nothing, it seems, raises the hackles of candidates and supporters from both sides of the aisle like alleged dirty tricks with campaign signs – be they vandalized, stolen or illegally placed.

With complaints rolling in on a daily basis, this fall has been no different, although some area communities are taking a decidedly low-key approach in dealing with sign scofflaws.

Canton is an exception. Township employees, along with a small but dedicated band of volunteers, have been roaming local streets the last few weeks collecting signs that don't conform to the township sign ordinance.

"We get a lot of complaints," said T.J. Turowski, Canton ordinance inspector. "I don't know how many e-mails I've gotten over the last month."

"People just don't want to look at them."

## \$92 million WTUA project moving ahead

The expansion of the Ypsilanti Community Utilities Authority wastewater treatment plant moved into its final phase Thursday when the Western Townships Utilities Authority received bids on the bonds issued for the project.

Of five bidders, the low bid was offered by Merrill Lynch & Co. of New York at a net interest cost of 4.53 percent. Merrill Lynch will turn over the bond proceeds to WTUA on Nov. 26, said Tim Faas, WTUA director of operations.

"The 4.53 rate is an excellent rate," said Tony Minghine, director of finance and budget for Canton Township.

Faas agreed.

## Dems answer attack ads; GOP backs them

Kevin Kelley's Congressional campaign has launched a counterattack on flyers and television advertising Kelley supporters say distort his record, especially on taxes.

But the Michigan Republican

State Committee, which paid for some of the advertising, is standing its ground. So is the campaign manager for Kelley's opponent, state Sen. Thaddeus McCotter.

McCotter, of Livonia, issued a statement Oct. 15 that decried attempts to smear Kelley. McCotter called Kelley "a good

man who would work very hard if elected."

Kelley, Redford Township's supervisor, and McCotter are in a battle for the U.S. House of Representatives in Michigan's new 11th District, which includes Canton and other western Wayne communities. McCotter, Kelley and two

minor-party candidates will appear on the ballot in the 11th District race in Tuesday's election.

Kelley joined some of Michigan's top elected Democrats at the Redford Grill on Oct. 25 to mobilize a

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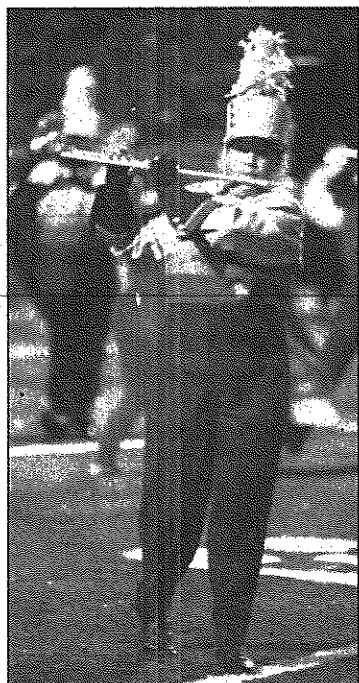

## Marchers finish state season on top

"It's 'Plymouth Time!'" said a pleased Clayton Wachholz, director of the Plymouth-Canton Educational Park Marching Band, at the conclusion of the Huron Valley Invitational held at Lakeland High School in White Lake on Saturday.

Capping off their Michigan competitions, the P-CEP band finished off a perfect season by once again capturing the Flight I first-place trophy along with all Flight I captions for Best Music, Best Marching and Best General Effect.

And with a score of 92.6 out of a possible 100 points, the hometown performers also marched off with the Grand Champion Trophy for the highest score of all 22 high school bands there, something they have done for 10 of the 13 years the trophy has been awarded.

"I'm pleased that we are performing to our potential now," Wachholz said.

"I heard a level of maturity tonight that we've not really

reached so far this year."

That, he added, is a "good sign," especially since about one-third of the band are first-year marchers — making it one of the youngest bands in recent Plymouth-Canton history.

"Having the show completed gives the students a lot more confidence," Wachholz said.

"Now, for the first time all season, I think we can actually start to make the show better."

Trumpet player John Lundy agreed. "You hear about plateaus — where you stop, level off and then start going up more," the Salem junior said. "We're at the point where we'll go up more now."

Ashley Spohn, a Salem junior and one of the four P-CEP drum majors, was excited with the band's performance.

"Tonight was very good," she said after the awards ceremony.

"Everything is coming together — we've learned our entire show and now we're cleaning our performance. That cleaning process is very tedious and sometimes not fun, but we've got to do it and

we are. It's what makes us good."

Those long hours of practice that began last spring are paying off in other ways, too. That's something Salem freshman Amy Reissenweber has noticed in her first year playing alto saxophone with the band.

"We are starting to really work together now and it is a lot easier that way," she said. "It wasn't so easy at the beginning. You have to get to know each other. It takes a lot of teamwork for this to actually work."

Other Observer-area bands at the Huron Valley competition included Farmington, fifth in Flight II with 68.35 points, and Livonia Franklin, sixth in Flight I with 76.4.

The P-CEPers will be heading to the Pontiac Silverdome on Nov. 2 to perform in the Michigan Competing Band Association State Championships.

Performance time is scheduled for 3:25 p.m.

The top 10 scoring bands in each of the four flights qualify for the championship contest.

Other Observer-area bands making the cut for the state competition are Farmington Hills Harrison, Redford Thurston and Livonia Franklin.

"We'll hit a good performance level at states," Wachholz said. "And we'll have two more weeks to get even better after that."

Those two weeks precede the Bands of America Grand National Championships, held Nov. 14-16 at the RCA Dome in Indianapolis.

There will be one additional performance between the state and national championships — 6 p.m. Nov. 9 at the P-CEP stadium.

"It's for everyone in the community," said Gerry Olessey, Band Booster president.

"This is a sendoff before Nationals for our marching band and kind of a thank you for the community. It is a special thank you for those who supported us with donations to purchase the new uniforms."

He added that there will be no charge, but donations will be accepted.

#### Q & A

Q: "How was the Prime Meridian set?"

A: In October, 1884, delegates from 25 nations met in Washington DC, at the International Meridian Conference to set up time zones for the world. The treaty adopted by the Conference made Greenwich, England the Prime Meridian (i.e. zero longitude) and set the International Date Line at 180 degrees longitude in

the Pacific. Every 15 degrees of longitude equals one hour and there are 24 meridians. While some countries do not strictly observe this system (for example, while China stretches over five time zones, it is the same time everywhere in China), it has brought predictability and logic to time throughout the world.

■ Discovery of King Tut's Tomb! On November 4, 1922, one of the most important archaeological discoveries of modern times occurred at Luxor, Egypt - the discovery of the tomb of Egypt's child-king, Tutankhamen.

Tutankhamen became pharaoh at the age of nine and died when he was only 19. Perhaps the only ancient Egyptian royal tomb to have escaped plundering by grave robbers, it was discovered more than 3,000 years after Tutankhamen's death by English archaeologist Howard Carter, leader of an expedition financed by Lord Carnarvon. The entrance to the tomb was found on this day but the tomb was not entered until later in the month.

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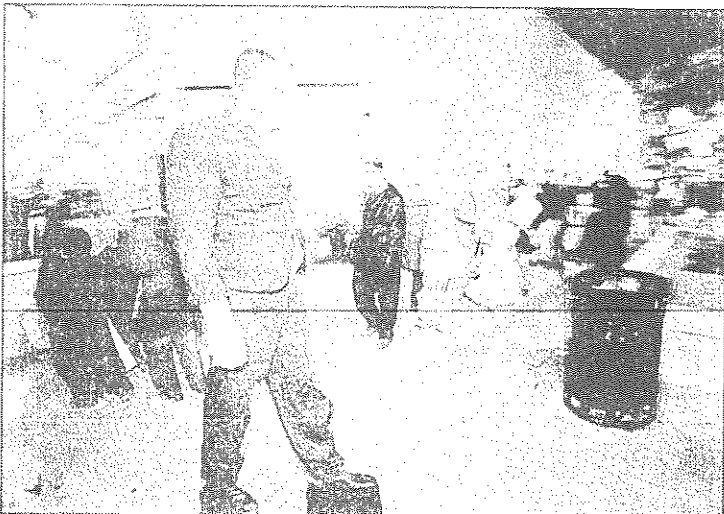

"We were a little bit nervous because during the two weeks leading into that bond sale the bond market turned a little unfavorable," he said. "But then it turned around."

WTUA provides wastewater services to the townships of Plymouth, Canton and Northville. It recently received a AA credit rating from Standard & Poor's, which reduces the interest costs paid by the townships to the bond purchaser over the 20-year life of the bonds.

The share of the debt service for the \$92 million project will be divided among the three communities, with Canton paying 33.75 percent, Plymouth 36.10 percent and Northville 30.15 percent. Faas said Canton's share would have been larger and the other two less, but Canton has contributed cash from its water and sewer fund toward the project.

The original phase of the project, construction of a large collection station and pumping station completed in the 1990s, will provide enough transportation capacity for the sewer system until the communities all fully developed, Faas said.

"The second component is treatment capacity to ensure we have enough (treatment) capacity going forward."

Both Faas and Minghine said a long-term goal of the project, dating from the 1980s, was to allow the participating communities to leave the troubled

Detroit/ Wayne County sewage treatment system.

"They (Detroit) are going to have to spend into the billions of dollars just to get secondary treatment capabilities," Minghine said. "This plant has full tertiary treatment. Once this project is done, all our flows will go to YCUA instead of Detroit."

Faas said WTUA's contract with Wayne County expires in another 10 years.

"This project will be done in three," he said. "That leave us six or seven years to determine how much capacity we would keep in the Detroit system. We've done projections to 2030 and think this expansion will take us that far."

He said once the expansion is completed, WTUA would have the option to sell the capacity it currently has in the Wayne County/ Detroit system to other communities.

He said WTUA also has maintained rights to a future expansion at the Ypsilanti plant.

"We'll decide down the road whether to participate in that," he said.

And what does all this mean to the average resident?

"It means that we are all going to have adequate sewer capacity in the future," Minghine said. "It's the kind of thing we take for granted. It's hard to find a more boring subject. When people think of public services, they tend to think of public safety and fire. But I know I flush a toilet a lot more often than I call police."

consultants Susan Kosky, Kathleen Glynn and Gladys Saborio on a survey of properties to be nominated as historic sites to the National Register of Historic Places.

The National Register is administered by the National Park Service and is part of a program to support public and private efforts to identify and protect historic and archaeological resources.

"This gives us a chance to examine historical buildings and sites within the community," said Melissa McLaughlin, Canton trustee and member of the commission.

Cherry Hill Village is already designated a historic district locally, but McLaughlin said getting a national designation would be prestigious because the requirements are very stringent.

"The state Bureau of History has to approve all the projects before they are sent to the federal level," she said. "And the state has been very serious about checking these things out to make sure they qualify."

One of the properties surveyed was the Cherry Hill House at Cherry Hill and Ridge. According to Glynn, the building was built in 1865 by Abner Hitchcock as an inn on speculation that a railroad line would be built through the village. That never happened.

"The building never functioned as an inn," she said. "It was sold in 1884 and converted to a general store. There was a dance hall upstairs that occupied the eastern two-thirds of the building."

The building was sold again in 1920 and is currently undergoing restoration.

Other properties that would be part of the historic district include:

■ Cherry Hill Cemetery south of the Cherry Hill House. The first burial in the cemetery was in 1831 and about half the graves are pre-1950.

■ Cherry Hill Methodist Episcopal Church, founded in 1834. The first building was built in 1848 and the present red brick Gothic style building was constructed in 1882.

■ Reuben and Sarah Gill Huston house at 600 S. Ridge.

■ World War II Veterans

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# Committee evaluates Wayne County judicial candidates

The ratings refer only to a candidate's qualifications for the position of judge in the court that the candidate is seeking, and do not in any way refer to a candidate's qualifications as a practicing attorney. The ratings reflect the collective judgment of the Committee and not the Detroit Metropolitan Bar Association as a whole.

Ratings are given after review of the candidate's completed questionnaire and/or an in-person interview conducted

with an Interview Panel of the Committee. If the committee feels there is sufficient information available on the candidate's fitness for the judicial office he or she seeks, the committee may rate a candidate, even in the absence of a completed questionnaire or an interview.

## FOUR CATEGORIES

The Judicial Candidate Evaluation Committee has four categories of ratings: Outstanding, Well Qualified, Qualified, and Not Qualified. Ratings were provided only in contested races.

If there is insufficient information available, a candidate receives a designation of Not Rated.

Forty-five attorneys from the Detroit Metropolitan area served on the Judicial Candidate Evaluation Committee. Detroit Metropolitan Bar Association Board Director Frank Nizio, of the firm of Bowman and Brooke, LLP, served as Chair of the Committee.

## THE STANDARDS

The standards for ratings are as follows:

**Outstanding:** To be rated "Outstanding," an individual must stand at the top of his or her profession.

He or she must rank among the very best qualified judges or lawyers available for judicial service.

This candidate must have outstanding legal ability and background, as well as wide experience, wisdom, intellect, insight, and impartiality.

To be accorded the highest rating, a candidate should generally have the breadth of vision and outlook that derives from participation in civic, religious, charitable or political organizations of the community, and the work of the organized bar or other professional associations.

In short, each should be a person whose preeminence in the law and as a citizen is widely acknowledged and whose qualifications are virtually hailed by judges and lawyers.

**Well Qualified:** To be rated "Well Qualified," an individual

must exhibit similar qualities indicated for the rating of "outstanding."

A "well qualified" candidate may have less breadth of experience, but shows the promise of all the criteria above.

Although this is a rating lower than "Outstanding," it is nevertheless a high rating.

**Qualified:** To be rated "Qualified," a candidate must exhibit a fitness for the judicial office he or she seeks.

A candidate given this rating would be considered average on an overall analysis of the factors set forth above.

**Not Qualified:** To be rated "Not Qualified," a candidate must be considered well below average on an overall analysis of the factors set forth above.

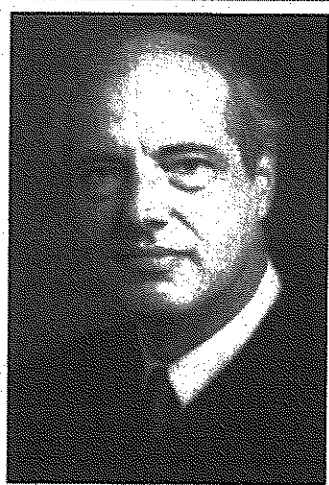

response to the ads.

"They can't win on the issues, so they're going to try a character assassination," Kelley told a group of about 25 that included U.S. Sen. Carl Levin, Congressman John Dingell and local officials and residents.

Kelley took issue with ads that portray him as a tax-raiser and say he "has voted to raise or create over 50 taxes and fees" during his political career. Kelley, township supervisor for six years, is a former Wayne County commissioner.

The portrait painted by the ads is "just an out-and-out lie," he said.

Redford's total property tax

rate has gone from 14.41 to 13.48 mills between 1996 and 2002, according to finance director John Cubba. Kelley said the decrease includes cuts in the sanitation and public safety pension millages, as well as tax rollbacks required by state law because of increasing property values.

"Six consecutive balanced budgets. No tax increases," Kelley said.

Kelley said the attacks slander all of Redford.

"We're not going to have the entire community dragged through the mud to get Thaddeus McCotter elected to the United States Congress," he said.

McCotter's campaign manager, Paul Bukowski, defended the ads, but said his campaign

isn't aware of what the state Republican Party is doing on McCotter's behalf.

"You just have no control over it. You have absolutely no control over it," Bukowski said.

He said Kelley's citing of Redford's millage-rate decrease doesn't answer Republicans' charges about voting to create or raise more than 50 taxes and fees. "No one's proving the distortions" are being made, Bukowski said.

"If you go into the record, the records are there," he added.

Jason Brewer, a spokesman for the Republican State Committee, said the "over 50" number includes any fee, such as for garage-sale licenses or a copy of a police report, that Kelley voted for during his time as a county commissioner and township supervisor.

When it was pointed out that it isn't unusual for local officials to periodically raise fees for services in order to pay for the cost of government, Brewer responded: "You can make that

argument," but Kelley's voting shows he "utilized tax and fee increases as a first resort rather than a last resort."

Kelley disagreed, and said the "over 50" number "sounds high," even including all fees he may have voted on during his time as a county commissioner and supervisor.

"We had to live within our budget and that's what we've done for six years," he said.

Levin, who is running for his fifth Senate term, aid at Friday's gathering that federal campaign finance reform enacted recently should change the tone of future campaigns by regulating the way money can be used.

But, given First Amendment free speech rights, he suggested, distortions can't be completely eliminated.

"The people have ultimately got to be protective of the truth in a free society," Levin said.

FIGHTING CLUTTER

Ron Lieberman is one Canton resident who doesn't like the sign clutter, particularly along major thoroughfares. "As far as free speech goes, that may be true for signs you see along residential streets, where a person is expressing their views," he said. "But in the commercial right of way, that's really just a bunch of paid staffers papering the township."

Placement of signs on public property seems to be the most common complaint, Turowski said. That's also true in Plymouth and Plymouth Township.

A political rival stealing or defacing signs is also typical. Smearing signs with Vaseline or other substances, rendering them unreadable, seems to be the preferred technique. Nearly all Michigan municipalities prohibit signs - political or otherwise - in rights of way. In Canton, they must be placed on occupied private property with permission of the owner.

The section of Canton's sign ordinance dealing with political signs also limits them to 6 square feet, with one sign per candidate, per issue. They must be removed within two days after the election. Candidates or committees are responsible for removing non-conforming signs within two days after receiving written notification by the township although people are rarely ticketed, Turowski said.

Turowski admitted pulling illegal campaign signs is something of a fruitless task. She works with another township employee but can't keep up with well-funded candidates.

"Sometimes we'll be going down one side of the road taking the signs out while (supporters) will be going up the other side putting new ones in," she said.

JUDICIAL RACE

The battle for the new 35th District Court judgeship has been a sign flashpoint during the current campaign. Plymouth attorney Mike Gerou, one of two judicial

finalists, has made it an issue.

"Judges are supposed to enforce the laws and ordinances are laws," Gerou said. "I understand that some people feel these stricter sign ordinances may be unconstitutional."

"But there is a way to address that and ignoring or violating the ordinance isn't the way to go about it."

Gerou and supporters have made numerous complaints and engaged in a letter-writing campaign over allegedly non-conforming signs put up by his opponent, Karen Woodside of Northville Township.

Gerou has also handed out written guidelines to his supporters on the proper placement of campaign signs in each of the district's five communities (Plymouth, Canton and Northville townships and the cities of Plymouth and Northville).

"I think probably every candidate has some supporters who are a little overzealous," Gerou said. "But the responsibility of making sure things are done right is up to the candidate as well."

Woodside declined to return phone calls this week to comment for this story.

OTHER STATES

Plymouth-Canton and Michigan aren't the only places where political signs are a bone of contention.

Alabama Attorney General Bill Pryor earlier this year lashed out at illegally placed signs in that state. "It's clearly illegal and it's clearly a crime," Pryor said in an opinion published last February, according to a story in the Montgomery Advertiser.

Pryor said people caught in the act would be charged with a misdemeanor that carries up to a \$500 fine.

In Missouri, signs placed in the right of way have become a safety issue and state department of transportation employees have been ordered to remove them. The signs often block the view at intersections or serve as a distraction to drivers, a department engineer said in a press release issued last summer.

How and where to vote Tuesday

Voters in Canton and across Michigan will be choosing a new governor on Tuesday, as well as voting for Congress, state legislators, county and local officials and several key ballot proposals.

The polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Tuesday. Anyone standing in line at 8 p.m. will be allowed to cast a ballot.

Canton's population growth means there are now 37 voting precincts in the township, up seven from two years ago.

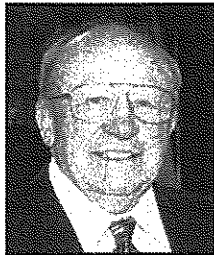
Local voters may also find an unfamiliar name or two after redistricting changed congressional, state legislature and county commission district boundaries last spring.

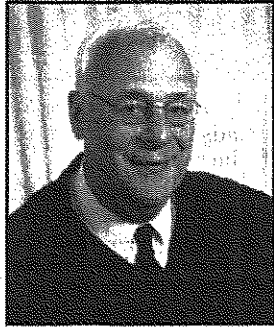

### Poor judgment

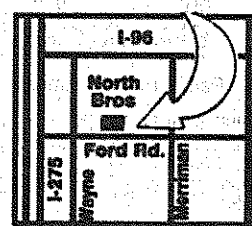

## McCotter gets 'credit'

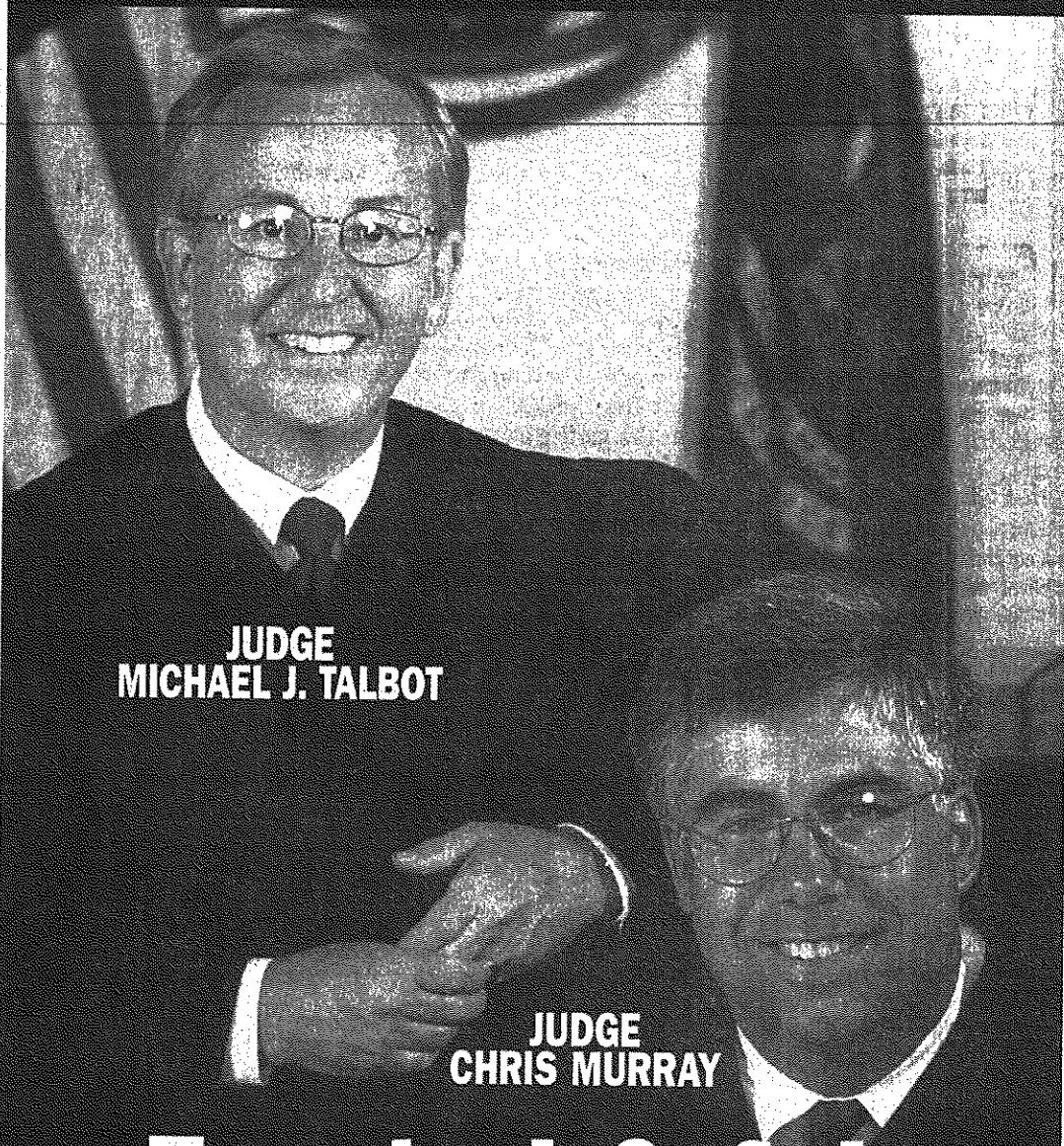

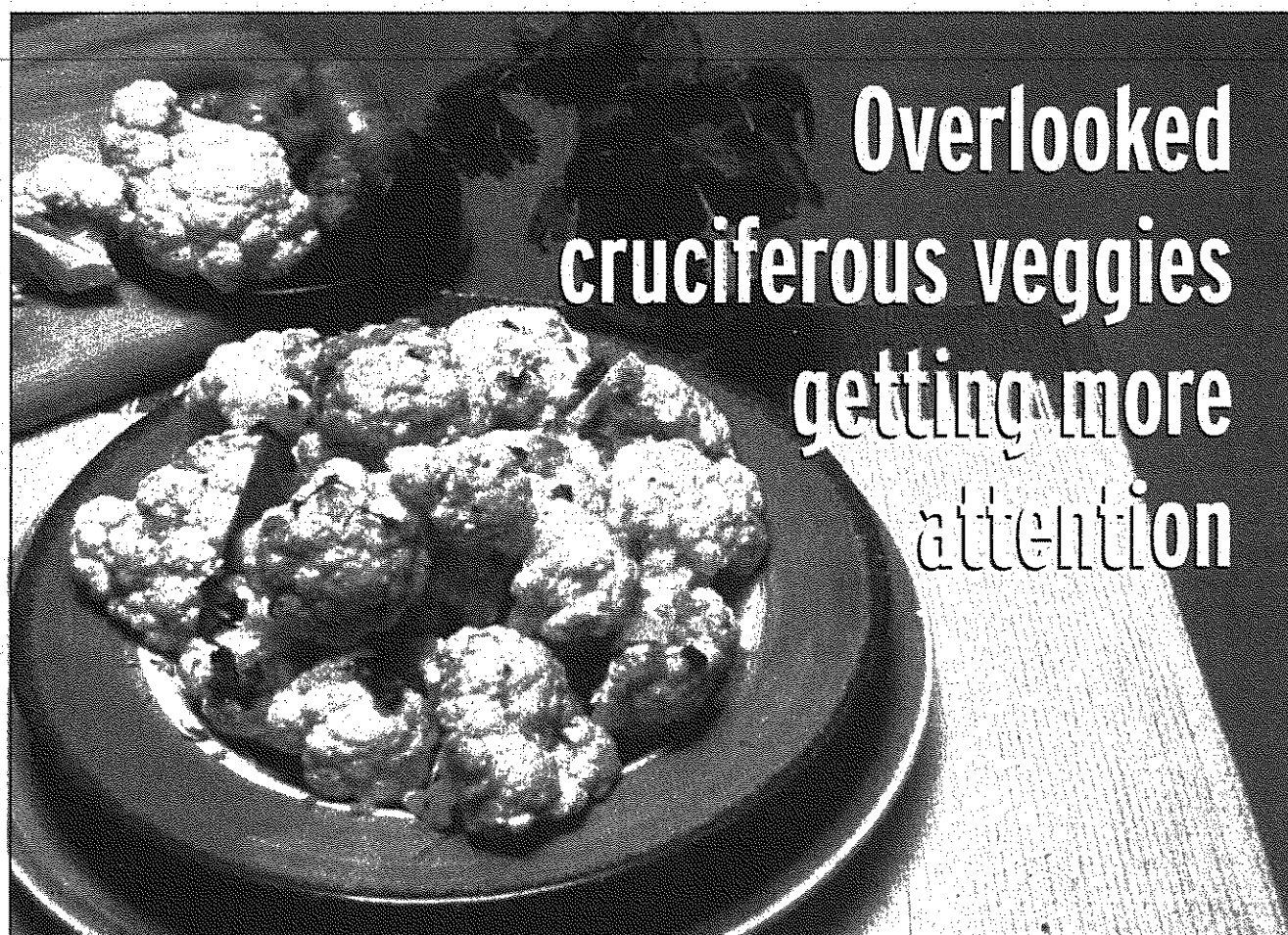

## Lowly vegetables pack a powerful nutritional punch

It's strange that certain vegetables can actually go in and out of vogue.

Take, for instance, cauliflower. Popular with families in the 1960s and 1970s, the white cruciferous vegetable took a back seat to its greener sister broccoli throughout the 1990s. Today, its health benefits are bringing cauliflower back to the lime-light.

Other cruciferous vegetables are being touted for their nutrients too: kale, cabbage, Brussels sprouts, beets, mustard greens, watercress, radishes, turnips and rutabaga.

According to the American Institute for Cancer Research, these vegetables can help fight colon, stomach, lung and maybe even breast cancer.

Cauliflower needs to be well cared for to prevent its pungent scent from filling the air and to keep its color white.

Dan Rowson, a registered dietitian and chef instructor at Oakland Community College in Farmington Hills, recommends adding two teaspoons of lemon juice to a quart of water to help maintain cauliflower's color when boiling.

"Texture is important and cauliflower shouldn't be over cooked,"

Rowson said. "It's best cooked and served immediately. The presentation is important to encourage guests to eat. Mix cauliflower, for example, with dark greens or diced red pepper to give it some color."

Doug Ganhs, also a chef instructor at OCC, suggested flavoring cooked cauliflower with red wine or rice vinegar to taste. Add a dash of curry or juniper, then chill and serve as a side dish.

On the subject of kale, both chefs laughed.

"Old school chefs will remember kale as the inexpensive, pretty garnish on the side of the dish," Ganhs said. "Look at any photo of a cruise ship dinner and the kale is always there."

But Ganhs also said that kale is under-used in America, and is more

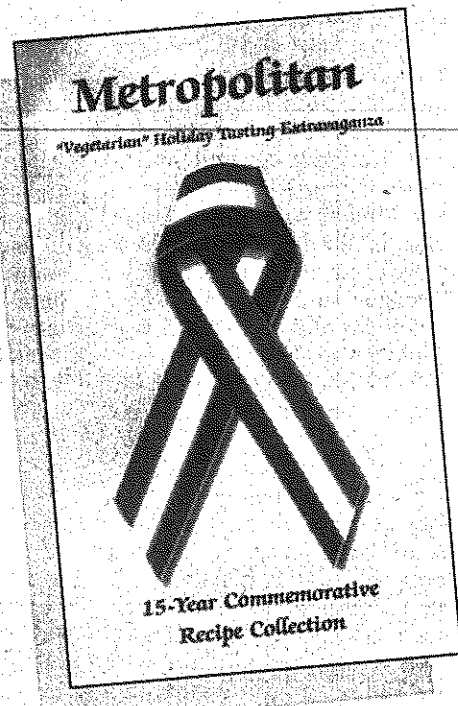
### COOKING TIPS

■ Cut broccoli or cauliflower into small florets. Place in bags and refrigerate. Marinate in lemon juice from half a lemon and 3 tablespoons vinegar mixed with one half tablespoon olive oil and herbs such as basil, thyme or mustard and eat cold as a snack.

## Enjoy wine more with classical music

Don Blackburn, winemaker at Byington Winery & Vineyard in Los Gatos, Calif., said, "Wine's purpose is to please people." He suggested that wine's pleasure has been over-focused on aroma and flavor, which use only 40 percent of a person's sensory capability.

He applied the term synesthesia to refer to the process by which the stimulation of one of the senses, in turn, causes another sense to be stimulated. He used music as the principal stimulant.

Synesthesia was in its prime from 1850 to 1900. Today, there's a renewed interest in how it impacts wine enjoyment. A number of artists in the late 19th century were true synesthetes and experienced a degree of trans-sensual perception beyond the average person. OK, but we're just a lot of average folks trying to enjoy wine!

"For whatever price a consumer is willing to pay for wine, it must not merely taste good or have vari-

etal character," Blackburn continued. "To be stimulating, the wine must offer a uniqueness of aroma and flavor. It doesn't really matter whether it smells like peaches or apricots. The most important element is whether the wine is balanced; whether it's awkward or elegant - and that's hard to put into words but it is sensed."

A good wine, Blackburn said, can never be characterized in its entirety but the tool that has offered him the most insight is music.

### EXPERIENCE WINE WITH MUSIC

Blackburn further referred to

research done at Yale University which suggests rotten apples, when inhaled, can elevate a person's mood, without otherwise altering consciousness. "I have not tested the rotten apples theory," he contended, "because music gives me the same result. Not just any music. Classical music, composed between the 17th and 19th centuries because it causes a predictable reaction. It has the test of time."

Being very left brained, we belong to the "show me" school. Since wine is part of the food pleasure process, Blackburn used a lunch setting as backdrop to have us discover the nuances of synesthesia, wine and music.

"People desire to be seduced by wine, therefore the mouthfeel of a wine is most important," Blackburn noted. He served a chardonnay without playing background music.

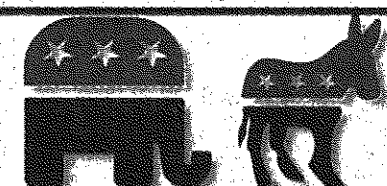

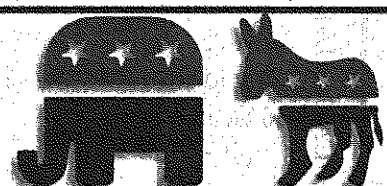

Pull large egg-sized balls of dough, turn out into fairly thin rounds. Fry rounds in hot oil until bubbles appear on the dough, turn over and fry other side until golden brown. Serves 5-10

popular in Europe. He suggests braising it, but because it takes a while to soften, it will lose some of its nutrients.

The same is true for mustard greens, Rowson said. Southern-style mustard greens are mixed with pork and simmered all-day long in a pressure cooker.

However, to avoid killing nutrients that method isn't recommended.

It can be braised with orange juice or red wine vinegar to cut the acidity.

Raw cabbage and cauliflower are mild in flavor. Both are stronger when cooked and can be steamed, baked, sautéed, or grilled.

Cauliflower is perhaps more versatile. It often accompanies grilled chicken or fish in Asian dishes, and is widely used in Indian dishes such as curry.

Popular health guru Dr. Andrew Weil writes on his Web

site [www.askdrweil.com](http://www.askdrweil.com): "Eat cabbage with some regularity. It contains compounds which may block (harmful) estrogen surges from other sources, such as environmental pollutants. Compounds in broccoli, kale and collard greens - all cruciferous vegetables - are also good."

Here are some healthy tidbits from the public watch group Communicating Food for Health, reported in March:

■ One serving of cauliflower, about 3/4 cup, contains a full day's supply of vitamin C.

■ One serving of cooked kale contains a whole day's supply of vitamin A.

■ Collard greens, kale, and mustard greens are good sources of calcium.

The calcium from kale is absorbed better than calcium from milk (50 percent vs. 32 percent).

Mark Twain said "Cauliflower is nothing but cabbage with an education."

tered dietitian. "It's designed to introduce individuals to the vegetarian diet and help them determine if this way of eating is feasible for them or their family."

In addition to providing more than 50 vegetarian creations to taste, cookbooks are also available for purchase at the event. This year's cookbook, which celebrates the Extravaganza's 15th anniversary, is almost 500 pages and contains recipes for all the dishes presented at the event since it began in 1988.

"The cookbook was a great undertaking, but we felt it was worth the effort. It provides recipes for the three main types of vegetarians and can help cooks make healthier meals," said Weaver.

The total vegetarian or vegan eats only fruits, nuts, grain, seeds and vegetables. Those who add milk products to the vegan diet are lacto-vegetarians; those who add both milk products and eggs are lacto-ovo-vegetarians.

Weaver says that nutritional research indicates the vegetarian diet is the healthiest way to eat.

"All types of meat have been shown to be associated with an increase of some cancers. Also, the vegetarian diet can aid in the prevention of heart disease," she said.

A certified fitness instructor, Weaver suggests that when changing over to vegetarianism, it is best to make a few small changes at a time to allow body chemistry to adjust.

"A few meatless meals two or three times a week may be the best way to start," she said. "Then, slowly increase the meatless meals until meat is totally eliminated from the diet."

The Holiday Tasting Extravaganza focuses primarily on vegetarian dishes for special occasions. "Because of this, some of the dishes contain more fat and other ingredients than are used by vegetarians on a daily basis," said Weaver. "We wanted to showcase these special dishes so nonvegetarians can experience how good the food is and vegetarians can add new recipes to their holiday meals."

In addition to the food tasting, the event will offer holiday decorations and musical selections and a food store with a variety of vegetarian products for purchase.

"This event has become so popular that it has been sold out in past years," said Weaver. "It's advisable to order tickets in advance." The 15th anniversary cookbook costs \$25 including mailing, and may be ordered by calling (734) 495-0472.

Here are three recipes from the cookbook.

## BLACK BEAN RELISH

3 (15 ounce) cans black beans, rinsed and drained  
1 cup wheat berries, light colored and cooked\*  
1 cup white rice, cooked  
2 cups frozen corn, thawed  
1 red (or green or yellow or one of each) bell pepper, diced  
2 tablespoons red onion, diced  
3 tablespoons cilantro, chopped  
1 tablespoon olive oil  
3 tablespoons red wine vinegar  
2 teaspoons cumin  
Salt & pepper to taste

\*Wheat berries are the whole kernel of wheat before it is cracked. Cook in 2 parts water to 1 part wheat berries as you would brown rice.

Mix all the ingredients in the order given and refrigerate. Wrap in LaWash bread, tortillas or pita bread, or serve on a bed of lettuce for a hearty salad or side dish.

Makes 15 servings.

## BARLEY BURGERS

3 cups water  
1/2 cup pearly barley  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup chopped onion  
2 tablespoons olive oil  
3 tablespoons water  
1/2 cup chopped walnuts  
1 cup (2 medium) shredded raw potatoes  
1 tablespoon onion powder  
1/2 teaspoons garlic powder  
1 1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/8 teaspoon thyme  
1/8 teaspoon sage  
1/8 teaspoon savory  
1 cup soy milk  
2 cups whole grain bread crumbs (Pepperidge Farm Stuffing Mix)

In saucepan, bring first three ingredients to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer until water is absorbed (about 1 hour). While barley is cooking, in a skillet, sauté onions in olive oil and water until soft. In large bowl, combine barley, onions and other ingredients until well mixed. 2 tablespoons vegetable oil  
2 cups coconut, grated  
1/4 cup water  
1 cup whole wheat flour  
1 teaspoon vanilla extract  
1/2 teaspoon salt

In a large bowl, thoroughly mix together all ingredients. Drop on cookie sheet that has been prepared with vegetable oil spray. Flatten with a fork. Bake in 350°F. oven until nicely browned.

## RED CABBAGE WITH APPLES

2 teaspoons canola oil  
2 medium tart red apples, cored, seeded, quartered and sliced  
1 medium head red cabbage, coarsely shredded (8 cups)  
1/4 cup non-fat, reduced-sodium chicken broth  
1/4 cup red wine vinegar  
2 tablespoons sugar  
Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

## CAULIFLOWER WITH GINGER

1 small head cauliflower, chopped into large florets (about 4 cups)  
1/4 cup hot water  
2 teaspoons canola oil  
1/2 teaspoons cumin seeds  
2 tablespoons fresh ginger root, minced  
1/2 teaspoons turmeric  
2 teaspoons freshly-squeezed lemon juice  
2 tablespoons fresh cilantro (coriander) finely chopped  
Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

Have chopped cauliflower, hot water, oil and spices near stove, ready to use.

Heat a large, non-stick skillet over medium-high heat about 30 seconds. Add oil and heat another 30 seconds. Add cumin and sauté just until the seeds turn brown, about 10 to 20 seconds. Add ginger and stir briefly. Add turmeric and stir to mix, then add cauliflower and stir to distribute spices evenly on cauliflower.

Add hot water, reduce heat to a simmer, cover and cook until the cauliflower is almost tender-crisp, about 3 to 4 minutes, stirring gently halfway through cooking.

Transfer liquid in skillet to a small pan and heat to a simmer. Cook gently to reduce amount by half. Meanwhile, increase heat under cauliflower to high and gently stir-fry to lightly brown cauliflower (about 5 minutes). Add lemon juice and chopped cilantro to pan of reduced liquid, mix to blend and heat through. Add to cauliflower, gently stirring to evenly distribute. Add salt and

## PURCHASING & STORAGE TIPS

- Cruciferous veggies last best when placed in a plastic bag and refrigerated. Use them within a week.
- Broccoli - buy broccoli when it is green and before the yellow buds open.
- Brussels sprouts - these "mini-cabbages" should have a bright green color with a firm texture.
- Cabbage - should feel heavy for its size and be free of blemishes or mold. Outer leaves should appear fresh, not wilted.
- Cauliflower - look for cauliflower that's white and firm, cut away slightly browned leaves.
- Greens - leafy greens should be crisp without signs of withering and are best used within a few days.

## LEMON-SAUCED BRUSSELS SPROUTS

1 small package frozen Brussels sprouts, or half a large package, or 8 to 10 ounces fresh Brussels sprouts  
2 tablespoons real butter  
1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice  
1/8 teaspoon finely grated lemon zest (optional)  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Freshly grated black pepper to taste (optional)  
Cook the sprouts according to package directions; if fresh, steam over boiling water on the stove or in the microwave. Cook only until crispy tender. They should be slightly chewy. If you overcook them by mistake so they are soft and mushy, do yourself and your family a favor and toss them out.

Place the butter over low heat in a small non-aluminum saucepan. When melted, add the lemon juice, the grated lemon peel and the salt. Let simmer for a minute.

Cut the Brussels sprouts in half (quarters for small children). Place them in a serving bowl. Pour the lemon-butter mixture over them. Stir gently but thoroughly to mix well and let the sauce get into the little crevices in the sprouts. Grate on some black pepper to taste.

## SWEET AND SOUR CAULIFLOWER

1 cauliflower  
1 tablespoon olive oil  
1 medium onion  
1/2 sweet red bell pepper  
2 medium stalks of celery  
1 clove garlic  
2 tablespoons fresh parsley, chopped, or 1 tablespoon dried parsley flakes

1 cup chicken broth, divided  
1 teaspoon salt or to taste  
A few red pepper flakes to taste (optional)  
Black pepper to taste  
1 tablespoon soy sauce  
1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar  
1 tablespoon sugar  
1 tablespoon cornstarch

Separate the cauliflower into florets, then divide into smaller bite-sized pieces more or less of uniform size. Steam or cook by your favorite method until crispy tender or barely tender, according to your taste. Drain well.

Cut the onion in half stem to root, then slice thinly. Cut the bell pepper into thin julienne strips. Thinly slice the celery.

Heat the olive oil over medium heat. Add veggies and cook until just starting to brown. Mince the garlic and parsley and add to pan. Cook a minute longer, stirring.

Add 3/4 cup of chicken broth (or water), reserving 1/4 cup to mix with the cornstarch. Add all the seasonings. Add cauliflower and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer just until celery is as tender as you would like it to be.

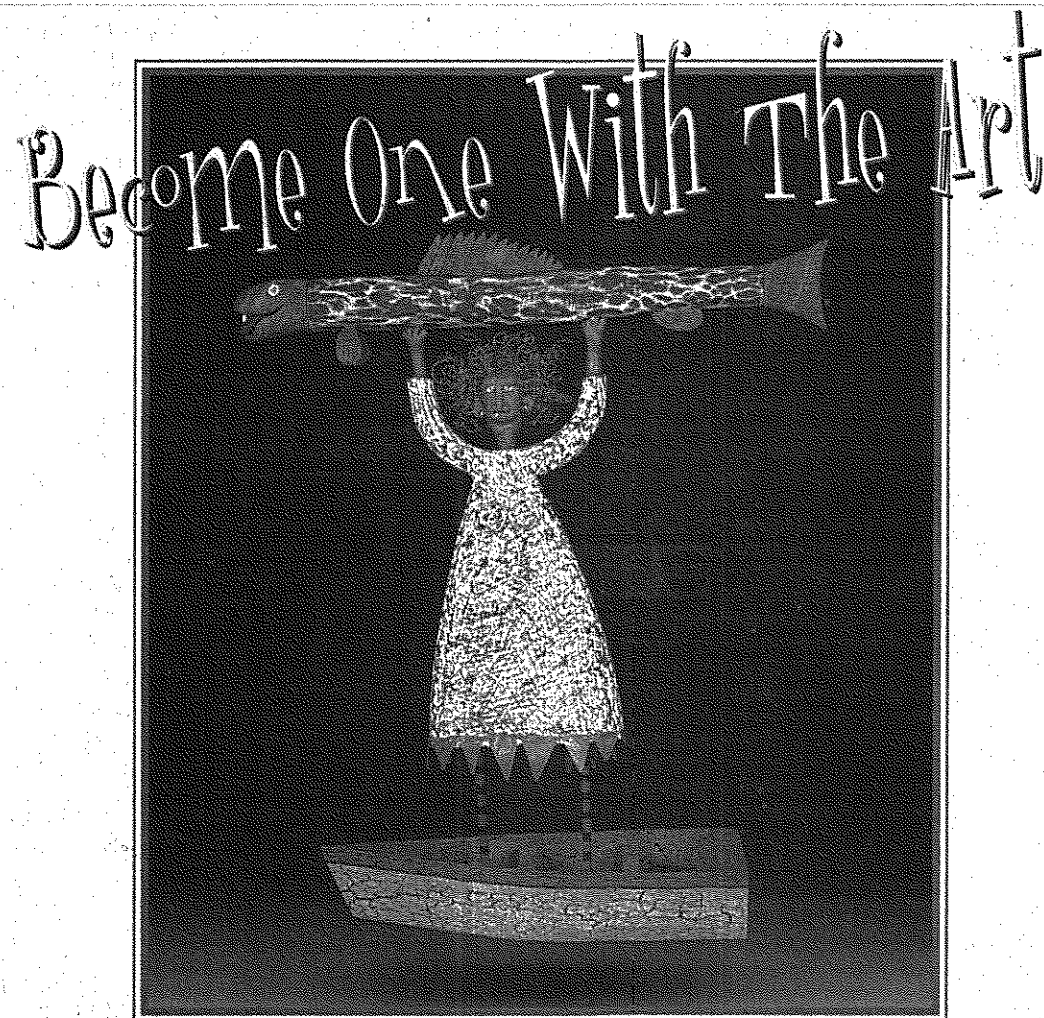
Mix the cornstarch and 1/4 cup of broth well. Add to the cauliflower, stirring constantly, until it thickens.

## RUTABAGA AND MUSHROOMS

1 medium rutabaga, peeled and sliced  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
6 tablespoons butter  
1 cup chopped mushrooms  
1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Cook rutabaga in salted water until soft. Drain, mash, and stir in 3 tablespoons butter. Sauté mushrooms in the remaining butter until brown, and add the rutabaga. Season and serve.

Nice wine. All those terms, tropical fruit and lemon-citrus flooded our brain. With Stabat Mater by Giovanni Battista Pergolesi from the original soundtrack of the film *Amadeus* playing, an immediate impression of the wine was created. We knew instantly whether we liked the wine or not, whether it was in balance, and were sensorily directed to discover all its nuances.

Try this out with two of Blackburn's wines, Byington 2000 Chardonnay, Santa Cruz Mountains \$18 and 2000 Byington Chardonnay, Sonoma County \$18 and discover what happens.

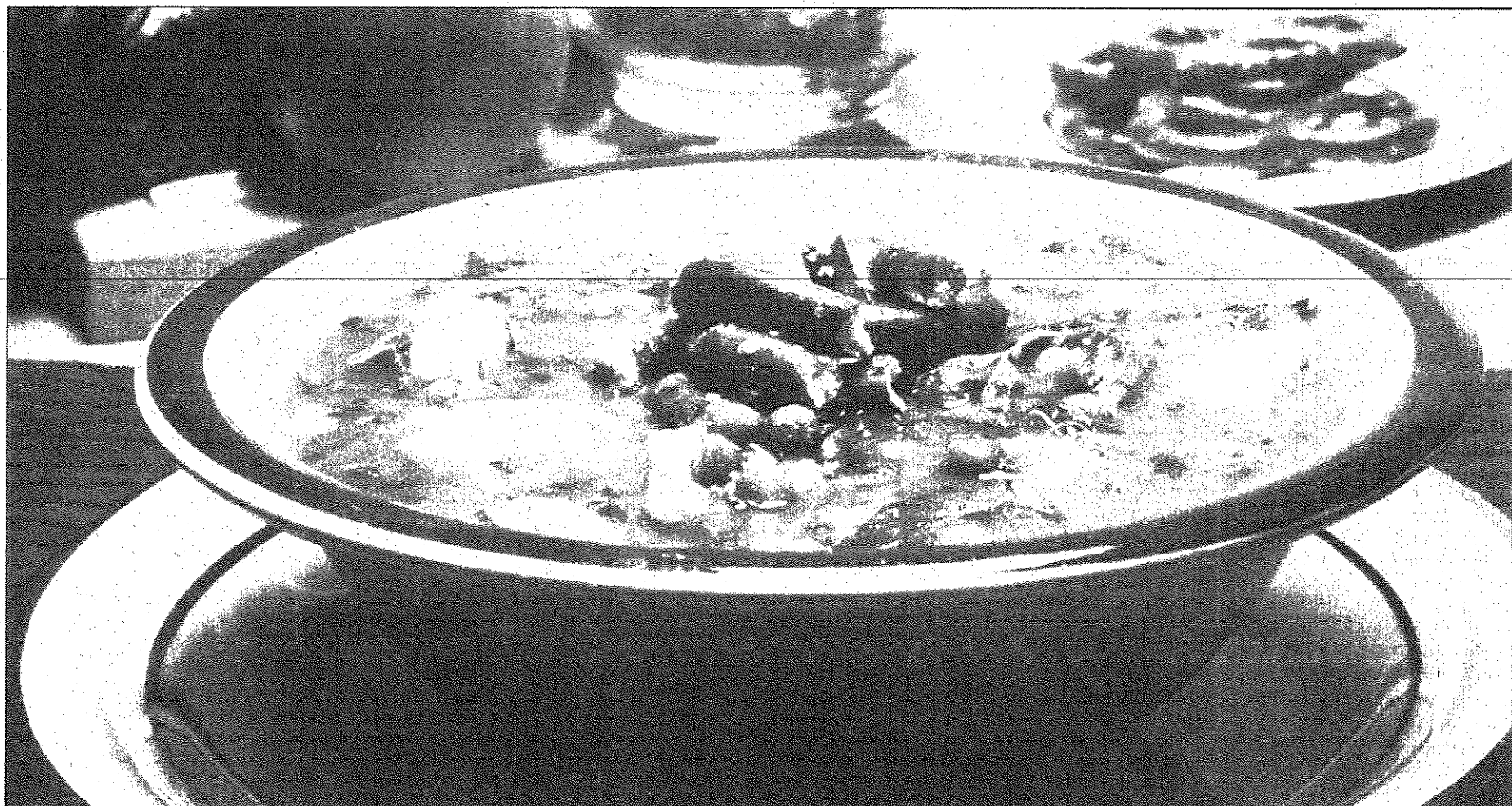
"We can continue to use terms such as lemony and buttery," Blackburn noted, "but I suggest we get to the big picture; that's whether the wine has charm, nuances and layers of interest."

Mozart's *Requiem Dies Irae Sequence* made the 1999 Byington Alliance, Sonoma County \$21, a blend of cabernet sauvignon, merlot and cabernet franc, seem bigger, bolder and somewhat out of balance. Haydn's *Maria Theresa Symphony No. 48 in C Major* smoothed out the wine's youthful, rough-edged impression and made it more enjoyable overall.

Did the music change our mood so that perception of the wine was impacted? It seemed that way. Is synesthetic matching a new wine tool?

"We need to better use all our senses to create a fuller enjoyment of wine," Blackburn concluded.

## Lentil soup, three ways to enjoy

Lentil soup is the perfect one-dish meal. Using a few basic ingredients, you can have a magnificent pot of it ready to eat in just one hour – and only 10 minutes is actual, hands-on time.

A generous, sustaining bowl of this easy lentil soup has just 215 calories, 15 grams of protein, a healthy 15 grams of filling fiber and absolutely no fat, even though it tastes too good to seem true.

Because I make lentil soup so often, I have developed many variations. Sometimes I brighten a bowl of this soup with a squeeze of fresh lemon juice. Changing the seasoning creates another variation, replacing thyme and bay leaf, for example, with oregano for a Greek taste, curry powder for Indian flavor, or ground cumin and coriander for Moroccan notes.

Adding more vegetables creates a variety of textures, colors and nutrition. I'll use diced potatoes and cauliflower, or chopped cabbage and canned tomatoes, sliced mushrooms, cooked chestnuts, shredded spinach or kale, or even diced eggplant and fennel.

I also use different kinds of lentils. After all, they come in red or orange, slate green, black and brown. All of them make great soup, with peeled, split, reddish lentils turning almost into a purée on their own, while the black and green ones stay nicely firm.

What I never add is fat. The lentils and vegetables go into the pot at the beginning, broth included, no sautéing first. This keeps the soup lean and quickly gets the mixture to a simmer.

This soup can be made with any of three different consistencies. Try them all to see which you prefer.

### EASY LENTIL SOUP

1 cup green lentils  
36 oz. fat-free, reduced-sodium beef broth  
1 carrot, finely chopped  
1 garlic clove, minced  
1 medium onion, finely chopped  
1 teaspoon dried thyme  
1 bay leaf  
1 leek, trimmed and chopped  
2 cups chopped Swiss chard leaves  
Canola oil spray  
1 Fuji apple, peeled and diced  
Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste  
3-4 large pretzels, broken into small pieces, for garnish (optional)

Place lentils, broth, carrot, garlic, onion, thyme and bay leaf in a medium Dutch oven or large saucepan. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat, reduce to a simmer and cook until lentils are tender, about 45 minutes.

For a chunkier soup, add leek at this point. Simmer 20 minutes, then stir in Swiss chard and simmer 20 minutes more.

Meanwhile, spray a medium non-stick skillet with canola oil and heat oil on medium-high heat. Add apple and sauté until golden on all sides, about 3 to 4 minutes.

When lentils are tender, stir in apple and remove bay leaf. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Serve as is for a soup with texture.

For a creamy soup, purée half in a blender and combine with remaining soup. Serve garnished with crushed pretzels, if desired. Makes 4 servings.

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## Writer says journal-keeping is creative, therapeutic

It is next to impossible to document all the events of your life, no matter how significant or insignificant, on paper.

That doesn't stop Iris Lee Underwood from trying.

Inside her 19 journals - some of them spiral-bound notebooks with tattered covers and yellowing pages, others are journals that have been given to her, taped with cards, letters, ticket stubs and newspaper clippings between entries - Underwood has written about all the joys and the good times she has experienced in her lifetime. She also has written about all the pain and sorrow without mincing any words.

And there has been pain.

Underwood lost her eldest daughter, Becky, six years ago to the horrors of drugs and alcohol, despite her and her husband's best efforts. And her mother, Sadie, suffers from Alzheimer's disease.

"It's very, very important when you're going through a trauma ... you need to mark your places. It shows our growth or lack of growth," said Underwood, 53, who lives with Mel, her husband of 32 years, in Leonard in northern Oakland County. She has two daughters, Kelly, 27, a French teacher, and Ruth, 25, an art student.

She earned her bachelor's degree in communications

from Oakland University in 1998, two months before her 50th birthday.

She has kept a journal for 22 years. She says her journal gives her the opportunity to put down on paper what she is feeling at the time. It has been an outlet to vent her anger and frustration in a productive capacity.

"Basically, my journal is my savior," she says. "It's my ultimate friend. It does not judge me. I can write through anything. I can say anything I want, any doubt I have, any fear I have, I won't be judged for it. It's what I'm thinking, be it good or bad."

### STARTING A JOURNAL

Underwood, who teaches workshops in journal writing, wrote her first journal entries when she was 11, after attending the funeral of a neighbor's 9-year-old daughter. It wasn't until the early 1980s after reading Catherine Marshall's novel, *Christy*, that she considered becoming a serious journal writer.

"My grandmother's life was passing away without record. My mother's life was passing away without any record. My life was passing away without any record. Three generations," she said. "So, what kind of example was I going to set?

Would I have just allowed three generations to vanish without any documentation for my children?"

Despite her enthusiasm, there were no books or magazines on keeping a journal as there are today, so Underwood just wrote. She took some advice from her daughters' teachers who made their students keep journals. She decided that if a junior high school student could journal, so could she.

Her first journal entries started out as a dialogue with God.

"Now my journal is multidimensional because I've grown. I've changed. To me, that is the most marvelous benefit of keeping a personal journal."

Keeping a journal also helped Underwood through a crisis of faith, as well as her redefinition of God and religion. She describes her childhood as an "evangelical childhood." Her faith got her through her parents' divorce in 1967 and hard times in her marriage. But when Becky died, Underwood's faith was shaken.

"Becky died and yet there are women in the inner-city who don't know where their children are from moment to moment and yet somehow they survive. These are things I discuss in my journals. I'm finding my faith through the process of asking questions and pouring out my grief and my anger."

### TEACHING CLASSES

Underwood relays the story of Becky's passing at her journal writing workshops called "Writing Your Legacy," which are six- or 12-week-long courses, depending on where she's holding them. Since 1995, Underwood has taught these workshops in the tri-county area at book stores, libraries, coffeehouses and on a recurring six-week basis at the Troy Public Library.

Underwood's students are mostly middle-aged women. Only a handful of men have participated.

Her beginning workshops cover the definition of a journal and debunk myths of a "right" and "wrong" way to keep a journal.

"These are all hang-ups I've had and what's prevented me for years from getting really serious about writing a journal. 'Oh, there's a right way and a wrong way.' No, there is no such thing," Underwood said. "Just getting your thoughts down, your feelings, your plans, your dreams, just little mundane things. All that is historical information. It's part of our lives and is very valuable but we don't see it as valuable."

Underwood believes journal-keeping has caught on because of the self-help movement.

"Personally, I could not afford a therapist or a counselor. I also wanted to experiment with the creative

process. Creativity is vital to a person's mental health. I can never go through a session of one of my workshops without someone bringing me some kind of article they have read about the healing and therapeutic properties of keeping a personal journal," Underwood said.

### FOR PATIENTS

Frank M. Ochberg, a psychiatrist who specializes in traumatic stress, from Okemos, is a founding board member of the International society of Traumatic Stress Studies and teaches at Michigan State University. He encourages

patients to keep a journal and "express themselves on themes and issues after they've been traumatized."

"By keeping a journal, people turn their feelings into discussions with themselves on the written page and get it out in the open. As a result, they end up feeling better about themselves and undergo a journey of understanding and self-discovery," he said.

But Underwood adds that writers must tell the truth - no matter how painful - in their journals if they hope to grow.

"If you don't, then you're missing the whole object of writing a journal," she said.

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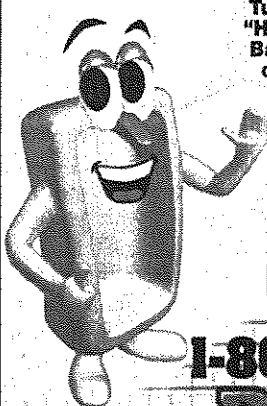
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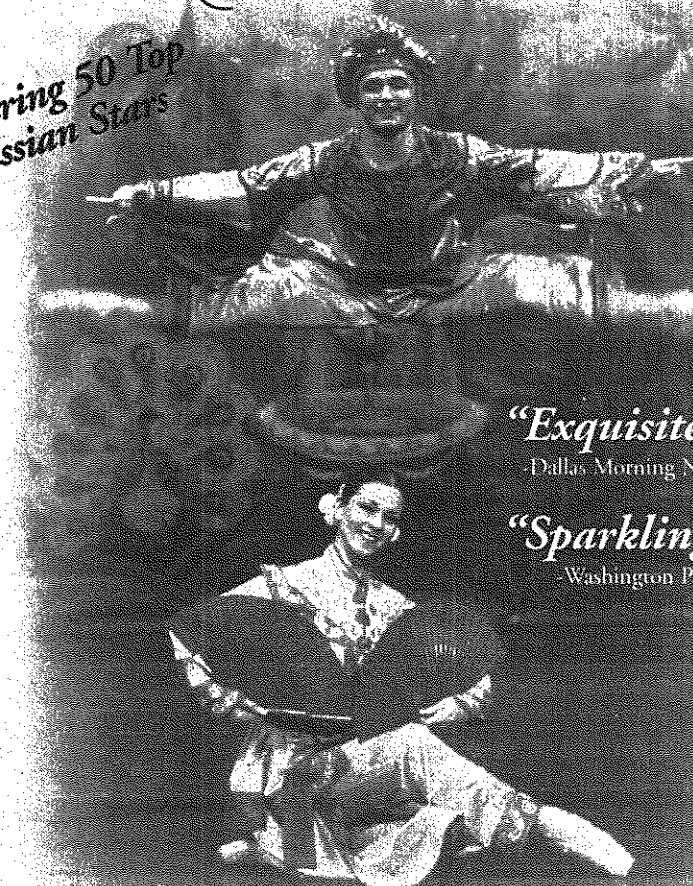

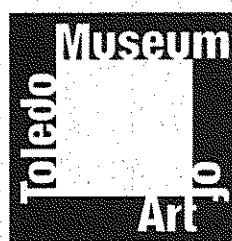

"We are the political heart of the state," said Tracy Padot, communications manager for the Greater Lansing Convention & Visitors Bureau.

For more than 120 years, Lansing has served as the state's capital. And, Padot said, depending on a person's interest, the city offers something for each age group.

Let's take a glimpse at some of the capital's government and non-government hot spots.

## STATE CAPITOL BUILDING

If you're pressed for time yet you want to check out the State Capitol Building, head to the first level directly under the dome.

Then, stretch out (or stand) on the floor – a spectacular masterpiece made with 976 pieces of glass – and look up 160 feet to the dome. It's awesome!

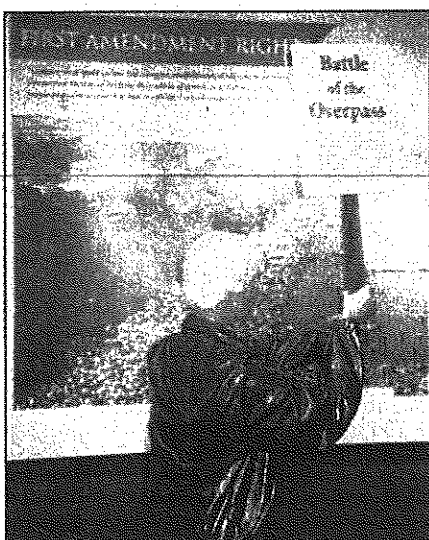
"Domes are symbols of their state, sources of inspiration and points of pride," said Kerry Chartkoff, historian and tour guide at the Capitol.

## HISTORICAL MUSEUM

Kids of all ages rave about the

Michigan Historical Museum.

Located in the Michigan Library and Historical Center complex, the museum features a potpourri of exhibits and interactive displays that weave throughout five floors.

The galleries, beginning with a depiction of prehistoric times, offer a fascinating view of Michigan's heritage through 1975 when Gerald Ford was president.

Wander through the replicated 1800s Upper Peninsula copper mine, gaze at the nose of a B-24 bomber, and then linger at the S&H Green Stamp Redemption Center.

If politics piques your interest, check out the gallery devoted to Michigan's struggle for statehood.

Before departing, be sure to visit the lumber baron's mansion and the one-room schoolhouse.

## SUPREME COURT

Do you know how a jury is selected? Have you ever wondered about the legality of a police search?

Discover the answers to these questions and more at the Michigan Supreme Court Learning Center.

The center, located on the first floor of the new Michigan Hall of Justice building, opened on Nov. 1.

The facility incorporates multiple learning styles, such as videos, computer programs and hands-on displays. Galleries are packed with information to educate visitors of all ages about the Michigan justice system and how it affects lives.

According to Vicky Kruckeberg, Learning Center coordinator, Michigan is charting new territory in reaching out to the public and to schoolchildren via this center.

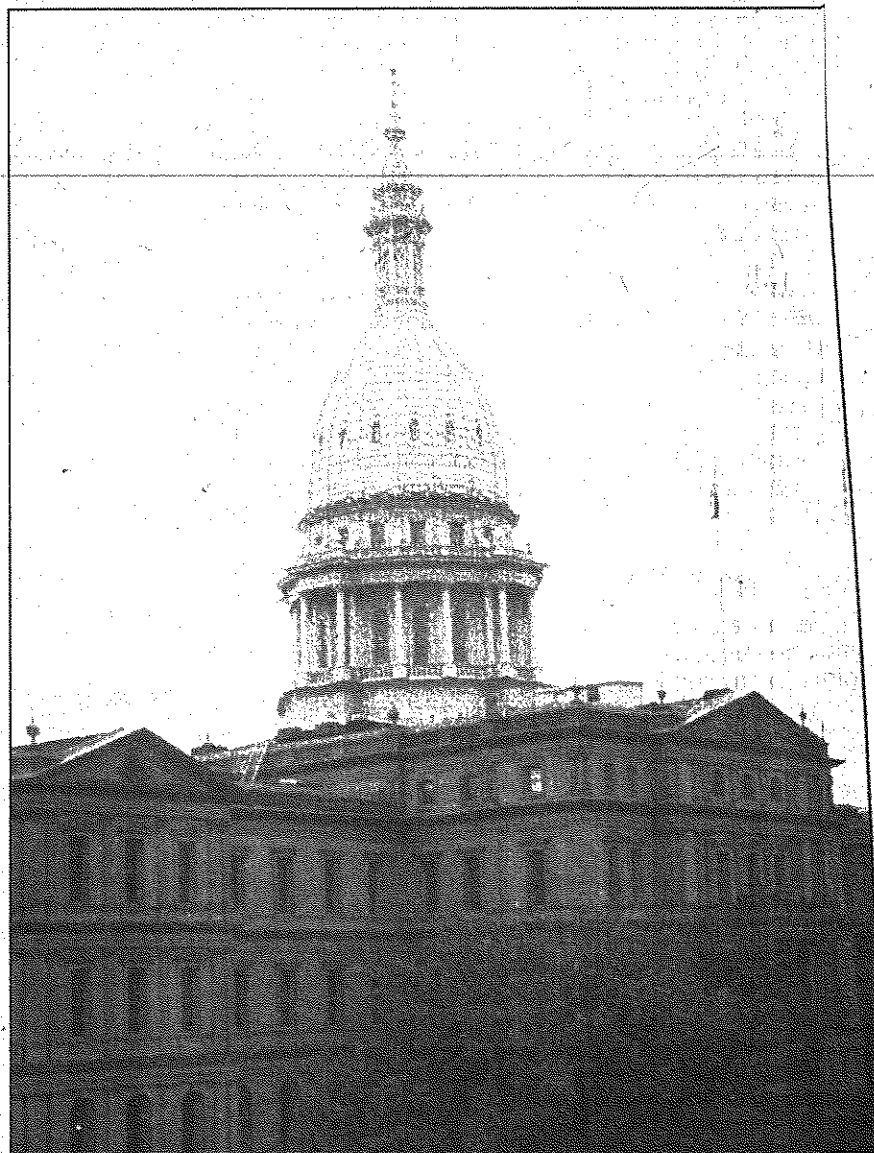
"We're breaking ground here with something that hasn't been done before," Kruckeberg said.

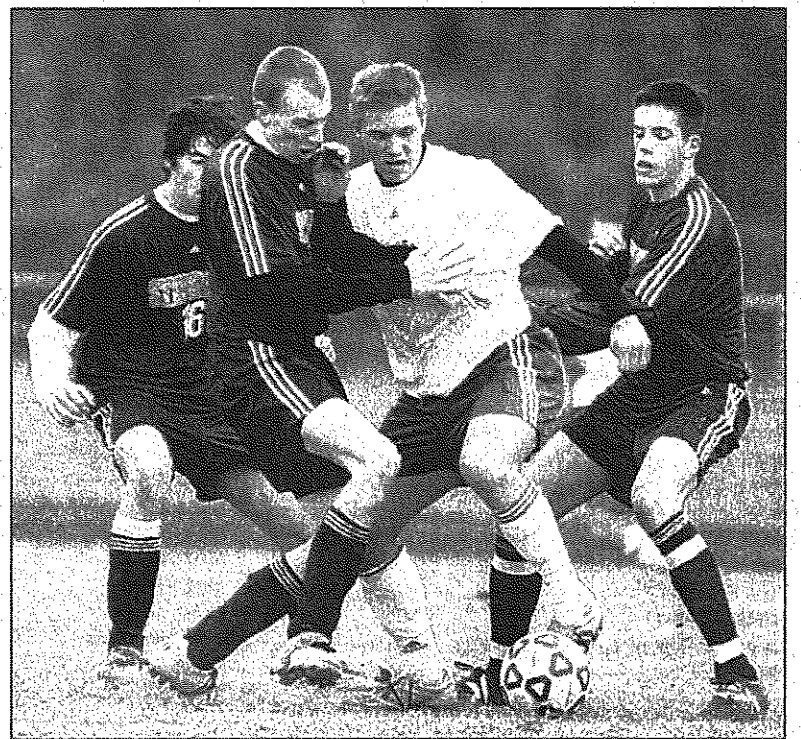

Renkens' goals are simple: to teach prep athletes who may be good enough and are interested in playing their sport in college how the recruiting process works.

"It's a combination of things," Renkens said. "You have to be realistic about the opportunities that are out there to get your education, and here's what you need to do."

Renkens tours the country giving his presentations. There is always an interest, since there are always athletes getting recruited.

The one-hour presentation addresses the who, what, where, when, why and how of college recruiting, addressing the myths attached to the process.

"The upper one percent of the athletes in the country will get scholarships," he noted. "A school will recruit a hundred athletes when they only have five or six scholarships."

"When you don't hear them by a certain date, you got to get real."

What Renkens tells so athletes who believe they are NCAA Division I-caliber is not be what they want, expect, to hear.

"It opens up their eyes," Renkens, whose background includes 20 years of coaching and administration at the high school, junior college and college level. Renkens has coached several championship-level basketball teams and served as NCAA congressman.

"I say, 'Here are your options, here are your choices,'" Renkens explained. "You really want to go on and play in college?"

Getting that initial answer is the first step. After that's understanding what a scholarship is for — to get education.

Renkens' program covers all aspects of recruiting, including when the athlete should start the process that camps to attend to get noticed, what to look for on campus visits, and how to obtain a copy of the NCIs, NALAs and NJCAAs "Guide for the College Bound Student-Athlete" free of charge.

One aspect of his program Renkens stressed was tie. Potential college athlete shouldn't wait until their junior year to start searching for a scholarship. There are avenues to pursue earlier than that which will maximize a student-athlete's opportunities.

Providing answers to many of these questions is what Renkens will attempt to do Monday at Northville HS. Game time is 7 p.m.

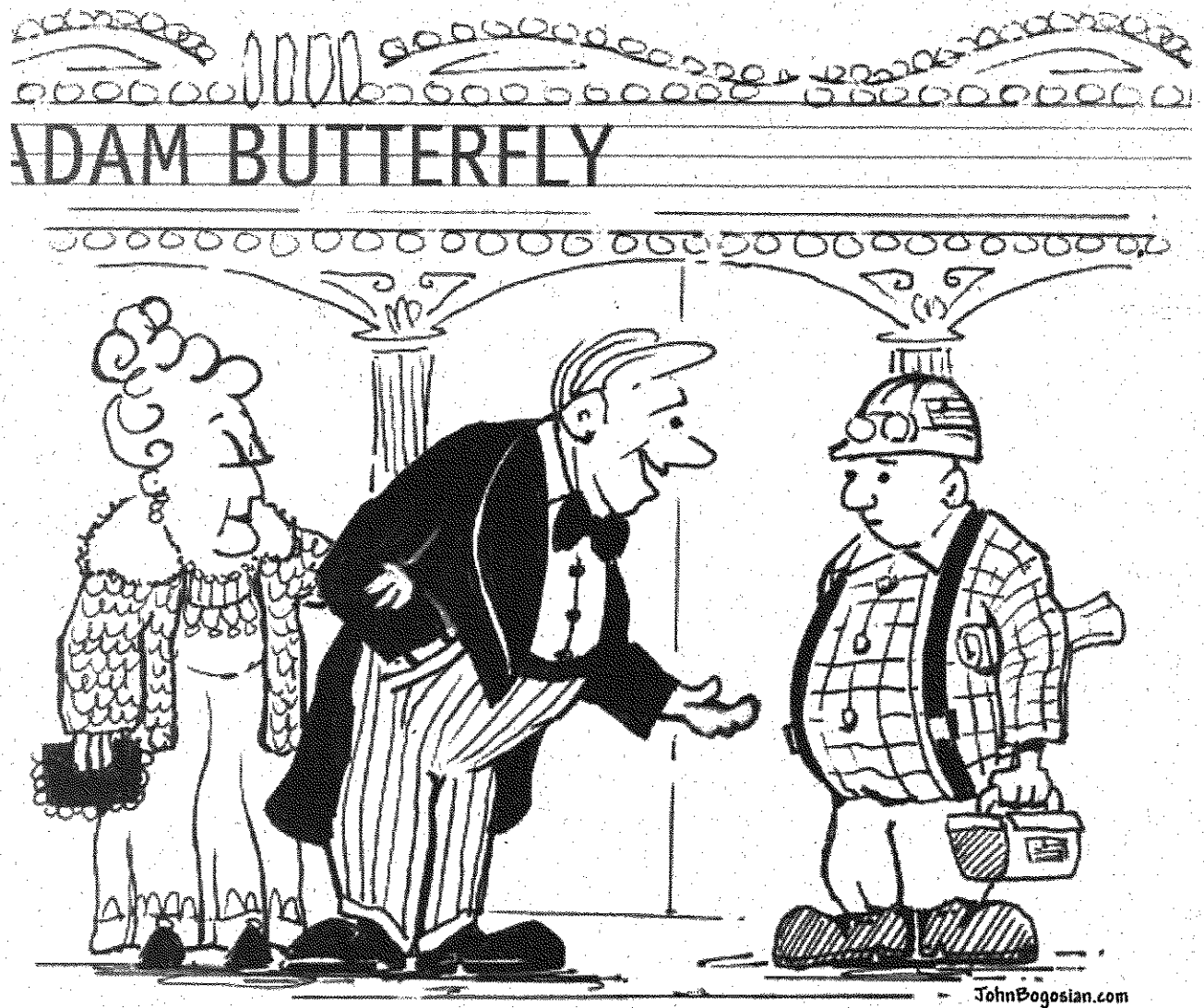
Tiffany Burns was the

lead a Canton ground game that would slice through the Rockets for 431 yards and a 49-27 romp in a first-round Division I state play-off game at Glenn Friday.

The Chiefs, now 9-1, advance to play the winner of the Redford Caholic Central-Livonia Stevenson game. Glenn finishes at 8-2.

"He just wants the ball," Canton coach Tim Baechler said of Joyner. "He's a leader."

Joyner certainly set the tempo for the Chiefs, and his teammates joined right in. Except for a short interval in the second period in which they gave up the ball on a punt (their only one of the game) and an interception, the Chiefs could not be stopped. Once, late in the second period, Glenn forced Canton to give up the ball on downs at the Rockets' 14. The rest of its drives ended in the end zone.

"We never did get them stopped," said Glenn coach Chuck Gordon. "They give you a lot of problems. They have so many different looks. The way they come at you, if it was just shutting on thing down it would be different."

Joyner finished with 206 rushing yards on 19 carries. Devin Thomas added 103 rushing yards on just seven tries, scoring a pair of TDs, and full-back Corey Rutledge added 98 yards on 14 attempts with two more touchdowns.

"This is a little nicer than it was eight weeks ago," said Baechler. Asked what the difference between then (a 46-21 Glenn win) and now and he answered, "Obviously the turnovers (six in the first game). We're executing and not turning the ball over."

Still, this was hardly a runaway win for Canton. The Chiefs did score the first two times they had the ball, on Joyner's 64-yard run and an 8-yard burst in the middle by Rutledge, to build a 13-0 lead.

Glenn was without starting quarterback Brian Ceckiewicz (out with a bruised kidney), and running back Tony Davis, also injured, carried the ball just once (or 3 yards). With the ground game struggling and the Rockets unable to stop Canton, Gordon was forced to

rely on sophomore quarterback Vinnie DeLuca.

On their first play of the second quarter, DeLuca pitched the ball to Jerret Smith, and he tossed a 71-yard option touchdown pass to a wide open DeAnthony Granberry, trimming Canton's lead to 13-7.

The Rockets would go ahead a few moments later, when Smith picked off a Nicoloff pass and returned it 30 yards to the Canton 14. A personal foul penalty against the Chiefs put the ball at the 7, and on fourth down from the 3 DeLuca hit Granberry with the TD pass. The placekick gave Glenn a 14-13 lead with 8:01 left in the half.

The Rockets kept the lead for 1:06. "We knew they wanted to shut down our running game," said Joyner. "We said from the start, 'Don't get down. Keep your heads up.'"

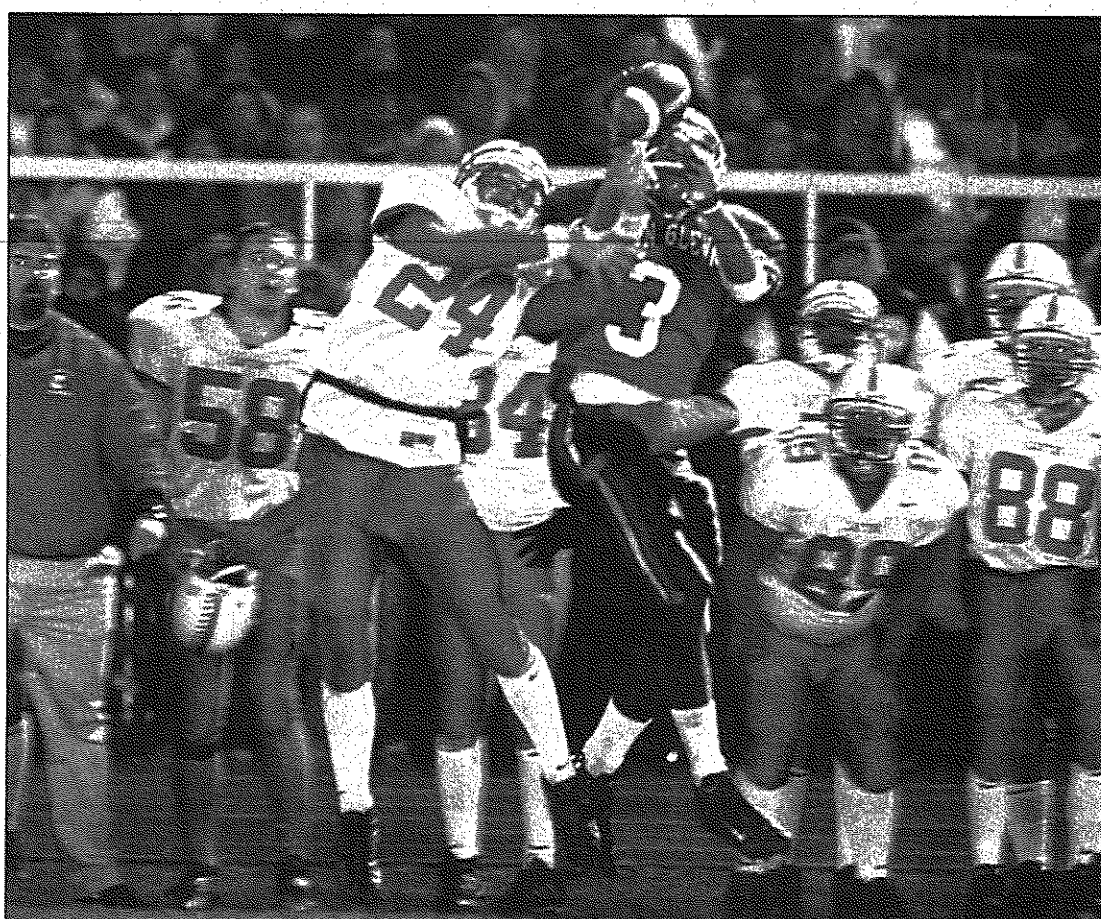
On the third play of Canton's next possession, Thomas busted through off right tackle and raced 74 yards for a touchdown. Joyner's two-point conversion gave the Chiefs a 21-14 lead, which they took into halftime.

Finding openings in Canton's pass defense, DeLuca continued to exploit them in the second half. Scrambling away from the pass rush, he found Smith with a 56-yard TD pass on Glenn's first possession of the second half, knotting the game at 21-all.

But two key fourth-down plays, one in each of Canton's next two possessions, busted the Rockets. On a fourth-and-4 from the Glenn 27, Nicoloff threw a fade pattern to Thomas along the left sideline. Thomas managed to outleap the Rocket defender and make the catch at the 1. Two plays later, Joyner scored to put Canton back on top, 28-21.

On their next possession, Baechler opted to go for it on fourth-down-and-22 from the Glenn 36. This time the Rockets were called for pass interference, giving Canton a first down at the 21. Joyner scored his third TD on a 2-yard run, increasing the Chiefs' lead to 35-21.

Glenn gave it one more shot, putting together a seven-play, 79-yard drive that included a 53-yard catch by Granberry in which he leapt over the Canton defender, bobbled the ball, then grabbed it at the Canton 23. Smith hauled in a 28-yard scoring strike on a fly pattern down the right sideline and Glenn was within 35-27.

But the Chiefs would not be stopped, traveling 76 yards in 11 plays, the key a 12-yard pass completion to Thomas on third-down-and-12 from the Glenn 17. Thomas carried the ball up the middle for the final 5 yards and Canton led 42-27 with 4:23 left in the game.

The final Canton TD came after Glenn surrendered the ball on downs at its own 31. Rutledge's 15-yard burst made it 49-27.

The Rockets never did get a ground game established, partly — as Gordon pointed out — because they were playing catch-up most of the game. They finished with 25 yards on 20 attempts.

However, DeLuca did complete 12-of-26 passes for 220 yards and three TDs, suffering one interception late in the game. Granberry had five catches for 165 yards and two TDs, while Smith caught eight passes for 124 yards and two more touchdowns. He also threw the TD pass to Granberry.

But with a defense incapable of halting the Chiefs, Glenn just couldn't keep pace.

The Greyhounds fell to 4-10-2-1 with the loss.

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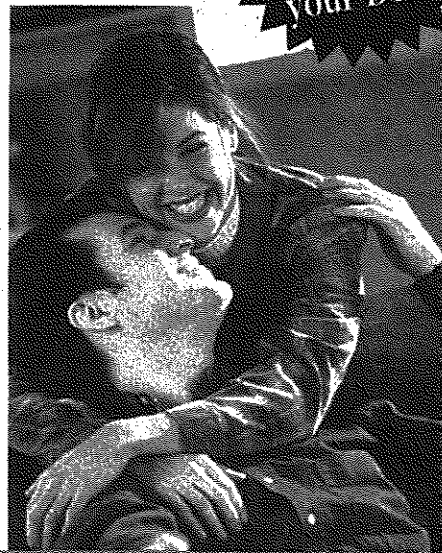

Stevenson bows out at 19-2-1. Salem is 19-4, having won 16 straight games; the Rocks advance to the state semifinals against the winner of the Brighton-Grand Rapids Forest Hills Central match. That semifinal will be at 7 p.m. Wednesday at Jackson's Mehall Field.

Both teams had chances to end the match earlier, but it was Jeff Everal, a reserve defender,

# Sleep apnea, a threat to life and well-being

Ken Cook of Novi knew his life was in danger when he sought medical help nearly three years ago.

Every morning, during the commute to his job as a business analyst at Ford Motor Co., Cook wrestled with a beast called sleepiness – a beast that threatened to crash his car and, perhaps, steal his life. As an added annoyance, he found himself dozing at his desk during lunch and falling asleep in front of the television every evening.

"Not only was I falling asleep all the time, but my wife noticed that I often stopped breathing during the night," he said. "I knew I had to do something."

After Cook spent two nights in a Novi sleep lab, the physicians handed him a straightforward diagnosis: Sleep apnea.

A condition as common in adults as diabetes, sleep apnea is the temporary suspension of breathing caused when soft tissues in the rear of the throat relax, blocking the airway. The sleeping person stops breathing for a period of time that can last from 10 to 60 seconds – or longer.

When the body senses the low oxygen and elevated carbon dioxide levels that result from not breathing, the person is aroused and breathing begins again with a loud snort.

The cycle continues during the night, and most people with the condition stop breathing, wake up, and start breathing again more than 20 times per hour, sometimes hundreds of times per night. Although they are usually not aware of the arousals, sleep apnea victims suffer from fragmented, non-restful sleep. The immediate result is often severe daytime sleepiness.

### RISKS

"Driving while tired can be as hazardous as driving while drunk," said Darrel Droblich, the National Sleep Foundation senior director of Government and Transportation Affairs. Droblich noted that persons with untreated sleep disorders such as sleep apnea are among those groups most at risk for automobile accidents.

Although it can occur in all age groups and in both genders, sleep apnea appears to exist predominantly in males over the age of 40 who are considerably overweight. The cardinal symptoms of sleep apnea are excessive daytime sleepiness and heavy snoring at night.

"While most people think of snoring as simply an annoyance, (it) may indicate sleep disordered breathing which should be evaluated by a doctor or sleep specialist," said Dr. Safwan Badr, president of the American Sleep Apnea Association. "Untreated, sleep apnea can cause much harm. Treatment can save lives."

According to the ASAA, sleep apnea can have dangerous consequences, including high blood pressure and other cardiovascular disease, memory problems, impotency, headaches and additional weight gain.

And, the number of people affected with the condition is growing.

Experts estimate that between 12 million and 20 million Americans suffer from sleep apnea, with perhaps as many as an additional 10 million undiagnosed.

"As our population gets more obese, sleep apnea becomes more prevalent," said Dr. David Hudgel, section head of Sleep Disorders Medicine in the Pulmonary Division at Henry Ford Hospital. "We're not totally sure of the exact cause of that relationship, but breathing and sleep is surely affected by body weight."

### DIAGNOSIS

To properly diagnose sleep apnea and determine its severity, most experts recommend a polysomnography, also known as a sleep study.

The patient spends one or two nights in a sleep laboratory so that physicians can monitor body functions. Some of these include brain activity, eye movement, heart rate, respiratory effort and airflow.

Based on results of the sleep study and the patient's medical history, physicians can make a recommendation for treatment.

"The biggest cure for sleep apnea is weight loss, so we try to encourage

(patients) to enter an exercise program," said Hudgel. "One reason that obesity is so prevalent, obviously, is our sedentary lifestyle."

But significant weight loss takes time, and patients often require immediate care. The most common form of treatment is a portable device called the nasal continuous positive airway pressure, or CPAP.

With this treatment, the patient wears

■ The Greek word "apnea" literally means "without breath."

■ Sleep apnea is as common as adult diabetes, affecting an estimated 18 million Americans, according to the National Institutes of Health, yet the vast majority of cases go undiagnosed.

■ Obstructive apnea is the most common type of apnea in children, and occurs when the child's airway is blocked or partially collapses during sleep.

■ In addition to attention problems, sleep apnea can cause high blood pressure, cardiovascular diseases, memory problems, weight gain and headaches.

■ The most common treatment for pediatric sleep apnea is surgery on the tonsils and adenoids, though the condition can also be treated with the use of a CPAP machine.

a mask over the nose during sleep, and pressure from the CPAP machine keeps the airway open.

"It works," said Hudgel. "If you wear it most of the night, it will eliminate the apneas, improve your sleep quality and almost totally eliminate daytime sleepiness."

The problem, he said, is one of compliance. Some patients complain of nasal stuffiness, facial skin irritation, inconvenience in being attached to a machine, or discomfort with the constant pressure of the machine.

There are solutions to most of the discomforts, however, and experts agree that the benefits outweigh any inconvenience.

Surgery is sometimes an option, depending on the individual, but effective only about 50 percent of the time. Medications have had only very minor success.

### IMPROVED LIFE

Ken Cook now uses a BiPAP every night, and he no longer worries about falling asleep at the wheel. The BiPAP is a variation of the CPAP, designed to follow the breathing pattern of its user. The pressure is lowered during exhalation, so breathing feels more natural.

"I had immediate results from using this machine, like night and day," said Cook. And the good side effect is that I don't snore anymore, so my wife sleeps much better, too."

## Book informs cancer survivors about use of supplements

According to some surveys, over 80 percent of cancer survivors are already using a wide array of dietary supplements or regimens in the hopes of preventing recurrence and secondary cancers, even though serious study of the effectiveness and safety of these approaches remains in its infancy.

"Researchers are only beginning to investigate the role of diet after cancer," said Dr. Steven K. Clinton, of Ohio State university's Arthur G. James Cancer Hospital. "And even though we have learned a great deal about how a healthy diet and lifestyle can help prevent first cancers, the hypothesis that these same healthy behaviors might help prevent recurrence is still just that – a hypothesis."

In the meantime, millions of anxious survivors who are not content to wait for the scientific consensus to build have begun to self-administer all manner of foods, pills and powders, often without their health professional's knowledge.

And unfortunately, there's no guarantee that informing their doctors will help survivors in their search for answers. Very few in the medical profession are aware of the ongoing research, let alone follow it closely.

### GUIDANCE

Cancer experts at the American Institute for Cancer Research are concerned that survivors who are turning to specific foods, supplements or regimens for protection may be doing themselves more harm than good. Many of the substances and techniques in question are showing powerful effects – for good and for ill – in laboratories and clinics. These effects come with real risks that could have a serious impact on health.

"These people need some guidance," said Glen Weldon, editor of a new book published by AICR called *Dietary Options for Cancer Survivors*, and they need it today. We can no longer ignore

the fact that millions of them are already taking things into their own hands. This late in the game, simply telling survivors to 'wait and see' – and expecting them to do so – is absurd."

*Dietary Options for Cancer Survivors* is ultimately a book that survivors and their doctors should use together," added Dr. Richard Rivlin, senior vice president for Medical Affairs at the American Health Foundation and professor of medicine at Weill Medical College of Cornell University.

"This book helps survivors become better informed about the wealth of options now being investigated and then go back to their physicians with concrete questions," Rivlin continued. "It may even encourage more physicians to provide dietary guidance tailored to the specific needs and medical histories of their survivor patients."

*Dietary Options for Cancer Survivors* helps cancer survivors navigate the limited but no less confusing mass of scientific information on how diet, supplements and complementary/alternative therapies impact the chances that cancer may return.

The book lists 48 popular foods, phyto-

chemicals, vitamins, minerals, herbals and dietary regimens that are currently being studied in regard to cancer survival, and presents pertinent research results in an easy-to-understand format. Containing over 540 reference citations that direct interested readers to the original research, *Dietary Options for Cancer Survivors* was compiled and reviewed by a team of researchers, nutritionists and clinicians.

*Dietary Options for Cancer Survivors* is a book for survivors to use as a reference, not a "laundry list" of foods to eat to prevent recurrence. The book does not endorse any particular food, supplement or regimen. Instead, it simply and clearly lays out the published laboratory and clinical research that has investigated the interplay of diet and survivorship.

The book's introductory chapters, however, offer a thorough overview of the kind of diet and lifestyle changes that have been shown to help prevent first cancers. The wealth of research on primary prevention provides a sharp contrast to the small amount of survivor-related research, and helps to illustrate how much more work needs to be done.

# Innovative nutrition program garners recognition

The American Institute for Cancer Research (AICR) recently received the American Dietetic Association's prestigious 2002 Presidents' Circle Nutrition Education Award. The award recognizes "the development and dissemination of scientifically sound nutrition information that is unique in concept, creative in presentation and free from specific commercial message or endorsement."

"With the New American Plate, AICR has distilled a number of vital health messages into a highly visual presentation that speaks to people in a simple, intuitive way," said ADA President Julie O'Sullivan Maillet. "This cam-

paign combines the latest science, a memorable, striking design, and a dose of old-fashioned common sense to simultaneously address short-term goals like weight management and long-term goals like the prevention of chronic disease."

In accepting the award, AICR Vice President for Education and Communications Jeff Prince outlined the New American Plate's beginning.

"The knowledge that healthy diets could lower cancer risk was driven home by AICR's 1997 Expert Report, which analyzed over 4,500 studies," he said. "That report showed that our everyday choices have a dramatic impact on our risk for cancer, and went on to stress

the importance of a healthy weight, regular exercise and diet high in vegetables, fruits, whole grains and beans."

Just three years after that report was published, however, American obesity rates had reached an all-time high, and the bestseller lists were thronged with "quick fix" diets. Experts at AICR grew concerned because many of these fad diets advocated cutting back on vegetables and fruits – the very same components of the diet that have been shown to be the strongest cancer-fighters.

"At the same time, American portion sizes – in restaurants and in home – had steadily ballooned. The common-sense notion of portion control was all but aban-

doned in light of the murky promises made by fad diets."

In such an environment, AICR devised a simple approach that makes it easier than ever to eat for lower risk of cancer and other chronic diseases. At the same time, the campaign combats the obesity epidemic by refocusing attention on the notion of portion size, and providing tools for adapting personal portions to suit individual caloric needs.

The simple advice: Take a look at your plate. Make sure that vegetables, fruits, whole grains and beans cover two-thirds (or more) of the plate, while animal-based foods cover one-third (or less).

Meals that are composed according to the New American

Plate tend to "push" high-fat, high-calorie foods off the plate in favor of plant foods that contain protective fiber and phytochemicals. Such cancer-protective, heart-healthy meals also help keep weight gain in check.

"There's nothing to count or measure," said Prince. "The program involves a simple rule-of-thumb that helps people eat for both weight management and reduced risk for chronic disease."

Since the New American Plate campaign was launched in September 2000, over one million individuals have requested the brochure. Subsequent brochures in the New American Plate series, titled *One-Pot Meals*, *Comfort Foods* and *Veggies*, have proven equally popular.

# New guidelines released for cleaning of hands

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently released new guidelines that advise the use of alcohol-based handrubs to protect patients in health care settings. The new hand hygiene guidelines were released in Chicago during the 40th annual meeting of the Infectious Diseases Society of America.

"Clean hands are the single most important factor in preventing the spread of dangerous germs and antibiotic resistance in health care settings," said Dr. Julie Gerberding, director of the CDC. "More widespread use of these products that improve adherence to recommended hand hygiene practices will promote patient safety and prevent infections."

CDC estimates that each year nearly 2 million patients in the United States get an infection in hospitals, and about 90,000 of these patients die as a result of their infection. Infections are also a complication of care in other settings including long-term care facilities, clinics and dialysis centers.

Improving hand hygiene will help prevent the spread of germs from one patient to another. Data show that health care personnel may be more inclined to use alcohol-based handrubs because they are more convenient to use. Recent studies show that these handrubs actually reduce the number of bacteria on the hands more effectively than washing hands with soap and water.

"Health care personnel are always on the go, which sometimes makes handwashing with soap and water difficult," said Dr. Steve Solomon, acting director of CDC's healthcare quality promotion division. "These handrubs should help promote hand hygiene because they are much more accessible than sinks, take less time to use and cause less skin irritation and dryness than many soaps."

The new guidelines recommend additional steps that

administrators can take to increase adherence to good hand hygiene practices. When deciding what products to purchase, administrators should consult with health care personnel on issues like smell, consistency and the amount of skin irritation the product may cause. If, as expected, hand hygiene products improve hand hygiene practices, preventing even a few additional health care-associated infections per year will lead to savings that will exceed any extra costs for better hand hygiene products.

The hand hygiene guidelines were developed by the CDC's Healthcare Infection Control Practices Advisory Committee

(HICPAC), in collaboration with the Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America (SHEA), the Association of Professionals in Infection Control and Epidemiology (APIC), the Infectious Disease Society of America (IDSA).

The hand hygiene guidelines are part of an overall CDC strategy to reduce infections in health care settings to promote patient safety.

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**CANES, WALKERS, WHEELCHAIRS, AND WINTER**

If you use a cane, walker or wheelchair you should prepare them for winter. First, the equipment should fit you properly. If you use a cane, then the top of the cane, where it curves, should come to your hip at the side of the pants pocket. The top of your walker, where the handles are, should come to the same height—that is, to the pocket area of your trousers or skirt.

Second, you should fit the bottom of the cane with a rubber tip. If you have a walker, all four feet should have rubber tips. Just like a good driver changes windshield wipers for winter, so should you change your rubber tips each fall.

If you use a wheelchair, be sure to purchase a seat belt for it. Wheelchair seat belts attach to the handles of the wheelchair, with the belt and buckle attaching in front just like a car seat belt. The seat belt prevents you from flying out of the wheelchair in case of a sudden lurch or uncontrolled stop after an unexpected rapid slide down a ramp. In winter time, ice makes an unexpected downward slide a possibility, and piled up snow may hide ruts or sidewalk edges that can catch wheels unexpectedly and throw you out of the chair like a missile.

In addition, you can purchase spikes or cleats that will fit under the soles of your shoes, giving you traction in icy driveways or walks. If your arthritis causes you unsteady balance, such an aid allows you to go out, if you must, even in the worst of icy conditions.

If you think it important to prepare your car for winter, so should you give equal importance to preparing yourself.

## Lighting now design mainstay in new, old homes

When people visit a friend's home, they probably first notice new furniture or artwork.

Not Scott Plemmons.

The first thing he looks for are lights. Or more precisely, how lighting is used.

"When you walk into a home where the use of light is planned, you see layered light and the right bulbs in the right fixtures," said Plemmons, Mr. Light for nearly 800 stores in the Lowe's Home Improvement Warehouse chain.

"For lots of people, light is the crowning touch to a room because it's the last thing you do," he said.

Plemmons says attitudes toward illumination have come light years from a decade ago.

"Homeowners are out of the dark these days," he said. "Now they light for mood, to create warmth, accent a room or just to make reading that much more comfortable."

And consumers, once reluctant to experiment with light, are now willing to change lights and lighting schemes as readily as they repaint walls.

"The effects you create with light help everything else in the room: artwork, furniture, wall colors, fabrics, you name it. Light enhances all those other elements," he said.

In part, the switch to light was driven by a furniture industry wanting more focus on fabrics and designs.

High-end fixture manufacturers such as Kichler introduced lamps and accessories to a home store lighting market previously dominated by department stores and showrooms.

Consumer demand has expanded from perfunctory table lamps to a wide range of purpose-specific fixtures including track lights, recessed canisters, chandeliers and touchier lights.

The notion of layered lighting – the use of various fixtures, bulbs and accents in a single room – is now a standard interior design practice.

In a departure from the brass look of recent years, demand for different finishes has exploded, Plemmons said.

"It's all about finishes now. Rust, pewter, white and lots of hand-painted finishes are what people specifically ask for. The fashion of light is a big deal," he said.

Even venerable fluorescent bulbs have seen the bright light of attention.

"In the old days, people associated fluorescent bulbs with casting a green pallor on everything in a workshop," Plemmons said. "But now you choose bulbs that mimic sunlight in table lamps as well as different levels of color, including warm and cool tones."

One element still rings true for fluorescent lamps: the whitish-tubes remain very energy-efficient.

Still, the public needs education to use the right bulb in the right place.

Instead of a soft-white bulb in every socket, homeowners find success with spotlights to accent paintings and flood lamps to wash a wall with light. The ultra-white light of halogen bulbs muscled a way into the options consumers face.

The lighting industry uses the Color Rendition Index to recommend lights to retain true color on any given object. One example is a warm colored bulb to illuminate a dark wood kitchen.

"The biggest thing is that homeowners are willing to take risks with light these days," Plemmons said. "The fixture market is such that they can afford to."

"When they repaint a room, add carpet or place new furniture, light isn't the afterthought it was even a few years ago. It's a mainstay of design now."

In addition to a 24-hour concierge service and French fusion restaurant, residents can use the ship's World Country Club, complete with an open-air golf driving range on the top deck, tennis courts and swimming pools. There's also a House of Graff jewelry shop, for those last minute gifts. Golf balls that stray into the sea dissolve after 96 hours in the ocean, officials said.

The ship's typical residents are self-made millionaires averaging 55 years old, ship officials said.

"They're risk-takers. They're involved in a totally new project," ResidenSea spokeswoman and tour guide Lisa Bailey said. "We're talking about a very refined person."

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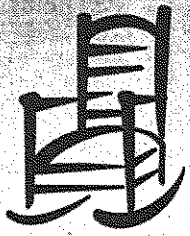


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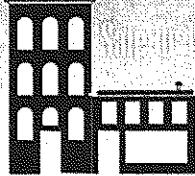
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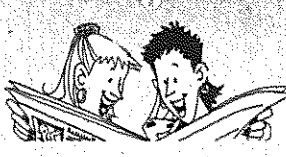
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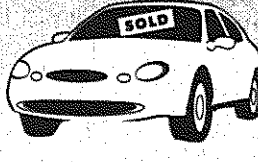
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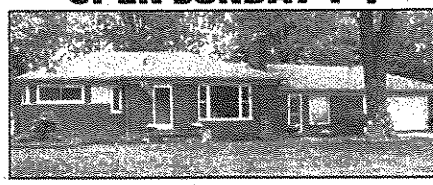
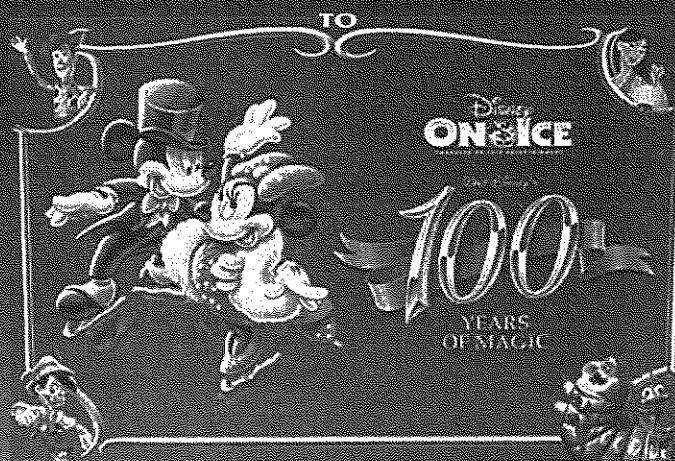
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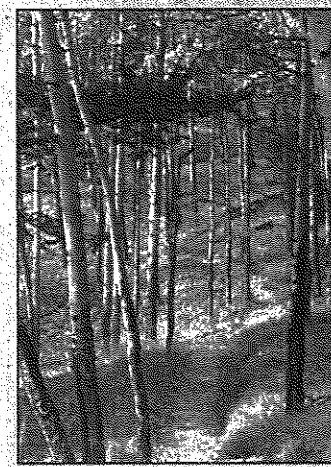
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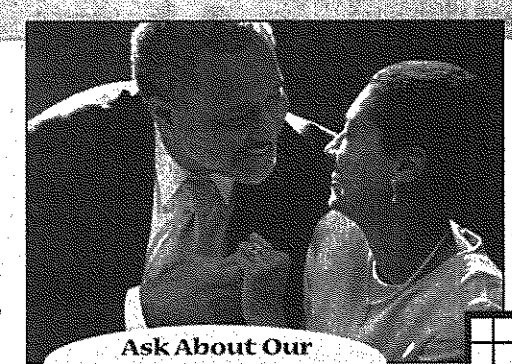

Looks can be deceiving. Very deceiving. The Dodge Neon looks like a tiny car. Too tiny, in fact. But when you step inside, there's a whole new ballgame.

It's quite roomy for front - and rear - passengers. I would never consider a trip in something that small, but you know what? We did take a trip in it - around a 350-mile trip - and other than need for a much better suspension, it really wasn't that bad.

Honest, I'm not crazy.

This year, the Neon is offered in the widely purchased SE and SXT models and the sportier R/T and SRT-4 models. The SRT-4 models are high-performance models with the "Street and Racing Technology" moniker, and its 2.4-liter turbocharged engine is capable of 215 horsepower.

Driven this week was the sporty R/T model. All Neons have better performance features this year. Dodge tweaked the automatic transaxle calibration to improve drivability and installed new engine mounts to make it quieter.

One thing that was most annoying was the road noise. In highway driving, it was actually necessary to turn up the stereo to hear it. I kept wondering whether I had it in the right gear. Speaking of gears, Dodge modified the fifth gear ratio on the manual transmission to improve mileage.

One thing I have to say - the mileage is great. The round-trip jaunt cost a little more than \$12. Yep, just \$12. You can't beat that with a stick.

The numbers range from \$29 mpg in the

city to 35 mpg on the highway. Nice.

The Neon has a high-output 2.0-liter single overhead cam 16-valve high-performance four-cylinder Magnum engine. It performs well in all types of driving conditions. Some performance features you may like are four-wheel disc brakes, dual exhaust and a five-speed manual transaxle.

There are also 16-inch aluminum wheels, leather seating surfaces and fog lamps to add to the sporty features.

Dodge considers the Neon a family car and puts a lot of safety features in the Neon to protect children. That means standard equipment includes the child seat anchor system, child-protection door lock, emergency internal trunk lid release and window lock-out.

There are other safety features as well, like safety cage construction, seat-mounted supplemental side air bags (an option), dual air bags, two-way adjustable head restraints and three-point seat belts for all three rear occupants.

Also new on the R/T this year are a new AM/FM stereo with cassette and six-disk in-dash CD changer. It was a nice system to listen to, but you have to be parked to use the CD. It's probably for anti-theft, but it's actually hidden to the driver and under the center

stack. Very hard to get to. But once you load those six CDs in there, and let the play, you won't have to worry about it.

Speaking of the center stack - it's actually color coded to the color of the exterior of the car. I thought it really added a bit of flair to the vehicle. Looked really nice, too.

Of course, there's a stack of standard equipment on the Neon. Stuff like air conditioning, leather-wrapped steering wheel, tilt steering wheel, cruise control, keyless entry, full length console with cupholders, floor mats, reading lamps, mirrors on the sun visors, leather-wrapped shift knob, 12-volt power outlet, power windows, power locks, power trunklid release, and rear spoiler.

First introduced in 1994 as a 1995 model, Dodge has always marketed the Neon as a fun-to-drive small car with a whole lot of value. Even with the top-tiered SRT-4 model, it still can come to your home for under \$20,000.

Decent value for a small car. And it's big on the inside, too.
