Newly elected State Rep. Phil LaJoy, R-Canton, has received his appointments to various state House committees.

Lotto winner

John Faris, 58, of Canton hit the lottery for \$4,836 in the Jan. 7 Michigan Rolldown jackpot. He was one of three jackpot winners in the drawing. The other two winning tickets were sold in Cheboygan and Ypsilanti.

The total jackpot prize pool for the drawing was \$14,589, so each winner collected \$4,863 before taxes.

In total for this drawing, 18,924 winners shared \$51,088 in prizes. In addition to the three jackpot winners, 121 winners matched four numbers to win a \$49 prize; 2,354 winners matched three numbers to win a \$6 prize; and 16,446 winners matched two numbers to win the \$1 prize.

"I saw the winning numbers while watching television," said Faris. "I couldn't believe I had won."

Faris, who is self-employed, purchased the ticket at Faris Market in Ypsilanti. He said he picked the number based on the birthdays of family members.

Stewart: 'Granholm is posturing'

State rep thinks threat of school cuts is governor's push for alternatives

Plymouth-Canton school officials are bracing for what could be a \$912,000 cut in state funding after Gov. Jennifer Granholm this week announced

an executive order forcing \$134 million in school budget cuts statewide.

However, at least one state legislator believes Granholm is just posturing, and the cuts won't ever come to fruition. State Rep. John Stewart (R-

Plymouth Township), a member of the House Appropriations Committee, said, "I don't think it will happen. Granholm is posturing and motivating us to consider delaying a reduction in the small business tax and the personal income tax."

According to Stewart, Granholm made the announcement to get the legislature working on bipartisan alternatives. "The economy is expected to

begin its recovery this spring, which means tax receipts will start to grow," Stewart said. "If we put a pause on the reductions in the single business tax and personal income tax, we can come up with a balanced budget."

"She has the Michigan Education Association and the public education crowd mad," he added. "She's got them motivated to call their legislators to find

another way to come up with cuts."

Stewart admitted lawmakers have discussed a worst-case scenario of reducing this year's state aid by up to \$65 per student, which would cut Plymouth-Canton's budget by just under \$1 million.


SHOPLIFTER NABBED

Local man heads for possible Iraq war

Operation Enduring Freedom is hitting close to home for a family that attends St. John Neuman Catholic Church in Canton.

On Tuesday, Marine Reservist Tom Piotrowski Jr., of Plymouth, was busy packing his gear and saying goodbye to family and friends. His Bridge Company Alpha unit has been activated, and is headed to California before a possible deployment to southwest Asia, as the U.S. gears up for a possible war with Iraq.

"We found out Saturday while at drill in Battle Creek (Fort Custer)," said Piotrowski, 23. "We knew there was a possibility of us being sent out soon."

"We were actually activated Friday, but they gave us the official word on Saturday," he added. "They sent us home and told us to be back by 1800 today (6 p.m. Tuesday)."

Last year, Piotrowski's unit was put on alert after the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks. However, this time it's for real.

"No matter how much you prepare for it, you really can't," he said. "It still hits you like a ton of bricks."

"As for concerns about myself, not really. That hasn't hit me yet," Piotrowski said.

"I'm really more worried about the people I'm going to leave behind, how they are going to handle it emotionally."


With tears in her eyes, his mother, Aurelia, is fearful, but at the same time knows her son has a job to do.

"I pray for his safety. I'm very proud of him," she said. "The irony of this is that my son is going to protect freedom, so we can continue to agree to disagree about our different political views."

Freedom isn't free. We have to fight for it and defend it."

His girlfriend, Renee Ash, 23, is trying to prepare for the sudden change in life's direction.

"I don't want him to go," she said. "I'm going to try and keep myself busy by going to

school and working so I don't have a lot of time to worry about not being with him."

While at Fort Custer in Battle Creek, Piotrowski expects to get briefed, be issued his orders and prepare to leave for California on Saturday.

"I'm leaving for probably a year," he said. "They told us it will probably be a minimum of three months and a maximum of two years."

Bridge Company Alpha specializes in constructing bridges for troops and equipment, and then taking it down until needed elsewhere.


"It's been a rough 70 hours. That's all they gave us to say good-bye and take care of any personal issues," Piotrowski said. "I would have liked that one extra day we were supposed to get. If we had a two-week notice, I probably would have gone out of my mind."

On Monday, Piotrowski put his personal life on hold. He graduated from Michigan State University in May with a degree in criminal justice, and had just enrolled in the police academy.

"Yesterday (Monday) was the first official day of classes and I had to go in and cancel," he said. "I was really hoping to get through the 16 weeks of the academy before something like this happened."

Piotrowski, who has a six-year contract with the Reserves, said if it comes down to a confrontation with Iraq, he would like to see the United States finish business this time, unlike the war in Iraq in 1991.

"I hope we take care of it so we don't have to go back 10 years later," he said. "I strongly feel that if it were taken care of the first time, this might not be a problem right now."


Sheriff re-establishes Internet Crimes Unit

Less than one week into his administration, Wayne County Sheriff Warren Evans announced today the creation of a new Internet Crimes Unit to track down, among others, sexual predators who are expecting to prey on children through Internet chat rooms.

To lead this new team, Evans has recruited the same officers who created the first county Internet Crime Unit in Michigan, which received national attention for its groundbreaking work. That unit, however, was disbanded late last year by the previous sheriff's administration.

"Internet crime, specifically in the area of sexual predators, is growing at an alarming rate every day. Our children are at risk and we need to use every tool we can to protect them," Evans said. "It is important that parents, and potential online predators, know that someone is watching."

Evans said the unit will consist of several officers, who will go online and pose as children in Internet Chat Rooms. Once a potential predator contacts them, the officers will establish a relationship that may eventually lead to a request for a sexual encounter. If a meeting is arranged, an arrest will be made at the time of the meeting.

Although its primary focus will be on sexual predators, Evans said the unit's scope will be expanded beyond what it was previously. "Other types of criminals we will target are identity thieves and computer software pirates," Evans said. "Senior Citizens, especially, are vulnerable to being tricked into providing vital

personal information that can lead to disastrous consequences." In fact, estimates by consumer advocates suggest that as many as 750,000 identities are stolen each year. An increasing number of those identities are stolen over the Internet, Evans said. Evans said the unit will begin operating immediately

and hopes it will be able to make its first arrest in the coming weeks. Anyone wishing to report criminal activity in any of these areas can call Wayne County's Internet Crime Unit at 313-224-0700 anytime. "It's for all ages, but more seniors take advantage of it," said McHale.



\$10 and will have two speakers.



Brandon Township, Northville and Howell.

The reading promotion runs through April 4, and will encompass Black History month in February, Havenstein-Coughlin said.

Gaines' 1993 novel is set in the black community in which he grew up in the land near River Lake Plantation near New Roads, Pointe Coupee Parish, La. He was born Jan. 15, 1933, in that community and worked in the sugar cane fields as a child.

The book is the story about two black men, one a wrongly convicted death row inmate, the other a teacher who visits him in prison, and their struggle to live and die with dignity in their community during the 1940s.

"Though the places in my stories and novels are imaginary ones, they are based pretty much on the place where I grew up and the sur-

rounding areas where I worked, went to school, and traveled as a child. My characters speak the way people speak in that area," he is quoted as saying in his publisher's Web site - www.randomhouse.com.

The book won the 1993 National Book Critics Circle Award for fiction. He is the author of *The Autobiography of Miss Jane Pittman*, which was published in 1971 and was turned into a movie starring Cicely Tyson.

According to his biography, he was raised by his maternal aunt, Augusteen Jefferson, who was the role model for Miss Jane Pittman. Gaines was the oldest of 12 children and at the age of 15 he joined his mother and stepfather in California to continue his education because there wasn't a high school he could attend in Pointe Coupee Parish and because at the time it was against the law for people of color to enter public libraries.

He is the writer-in-residence at the University of Southwestern Louisiana and

is a recipient of the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation Fellowship in 1993 for his lifetime achievements.

To promote the reading of Gaines' book, the Canton library will be passing out buttons and posters.

"We hope people wear the buttons and when they see each other, start talking about the book," said Havenstein-Coughlin.

"We'll also have a librarian going into the high schools," she said. "We'll bring copies of the book."

The book will also be the topic of discussion at the "Lunch and a Book" program at the Canton library at noon on Thursday, Feb. 13. The event is open to the public. People can bring their lunch and the library will provide coffee.

memorandum from the House Fiscal Agency, indicating "we are currently estimating that the proration for a full fiscal year will be 3.64 percent, resulting in a 3.64 percent across-the-board cut in payments for all school districts." Since four of the 11 school aid payments for the 2002-03 school year have already been

paid to school districts, the money would be taken out of the seven remaining payments. "I was very surprised," said Jim Ryan, Plymouth-Canton Schools superintendent. "It's well into the second half of our fiscal year ... there's really not a lot you can do (to cut the budget) this year."

"Kids and parents won't feel it this year, but our administrators will be told there will be a spending freeze," he said. "Next year is when the challenges begin."

State Sen. Bruce Patterson

(R-Canton Township) said, "We in the Senate will look at all of our options. This wouldn't be my first option."

Ryan earlier said that with Granholm's previous announcement there will be no increase in the state foundation grant for the 2003-04 budget year, Plymouth-Canton is facing a budget deficit of \$5 million. Ryan said that amount could be reduced to about \$3.5 million if the district continues to enroll new students.

"It's incumbent on the legis-

lature to come up with the money and take care of this problem by looking at areas we can cut from the budget," said Mark Slavens, school board vice president. "This is a bad precedent for school districts."

Under state law, the legislature has the greater of 30 calendar days or six session days to discuss and implement alternate solutions to cut the state's budget before enacting Granholm's executive order.







Spice up Super Bowl

For those unaware: This year's Super Bowl is in San Diego.

Since the city is steeped in Mexican culture, it only makes sense that our Super Bowl parties have some south-of-the-border flair.

Any excuse for fresh salsa! "It's the pizza parlors that will always get most of the Super Bowl food business," said Dino Grecu, owner and chef of Cookie's Carryout & Catering in Farmington Hills. "But it wouldn't be Super Bowl without chips and salsa."

Grecu isn't talking about the stuff in a jar. He makes his salsa fresh and sells a lot of it. The secret, he said is "fresh cilantro. You absolutely can't have it without it."

Add chopped red onions to sweeten tomato-based salsa. Keep it mild with a little bit of crushed red pepper, but if a party-goer craves it burning hot, add a fresh habanero or two.

"Pickled jalapenos are fantastic too," Grecu said. "They're not too hot, but add a really good flavor."

You can give many finger foods a Mexican flair — like serving fresh chopped jalapenos on crackers. Still, for a true Mexican theme it's not all about spice, said Francisco Rodriguez, of Rose Catering in Canton.

Rodriguez, who is of Mexican

descent and a gourmet caterer, said many people make the mistake of overspicing the food.

"Traditionally most Mexican food isn't hot," Rodriguez said. "A traditional taco or botana is mild. It's the salsa that adds the heat."

"My father's salsa used to be so hot you'd have to open the windows when he was cooking because it would burn your eyes," Rodriguez added. "He'd dry tiny hot peppers in the sun for weeks and then crush them into the salsa."

That much heat might be too intense for most party-goers, so it's important to have more than one salsa to accommodate all desires.


"My family makes warm tortillas with simple refried beans and salsa and that's heaven for me," Rodriguez said.

Straying away from the Mexican theme, Rodriguez said an easy party hit is cubes of pineapple wrapped in precooked bacon. The concoction is held together with toothpicks.

Help's on the way — answers to food questions

Here's just a sampling of these questions and answers that might help you, too.

Q: Someone gave me a pomegranate, what do I do with it?

A: The seeds are the only edible part of the pomegranate. These seeds contain potassium, vitamin C, fiber and the flavonoid antioxidants that may give your heart protection and help prevent cancer. Roll the pomegranate on the counter, cut off the crown end of the fruit, cut the rind, place in a bowl of water and separate the seeds from the skin and membranes with your fingers. Do not eat the bitter white membrane or skin. The seeds are scarlet or crimson in color. Serve pomegranate seeds on top of salads, sprinkle on a fresh apple pie or grill them on top of a meat dish. Mix them with other tropical fruits or make juice by putting seeds in a blender or food processor. Commercial pomegranate juice is available in specialty stores. This juice can be used in marinades, sauces, vinaigrettes or beverages. There are some wonderful stories about this fruit, such as they were an ancient Greek symbol for fertility and abundance and people would become immortal by eating the seeds.

Q: What are good or bad molds?

A: There are about 300,000 different molds. A "safe" mold is in the blue-veined cheeses such as blue, Roquefort, Gorgonzola or Stilton or the white molds of Brie and camembert. The fuzzy green mold that grow in the refrigerator on forgotten foods are bad! Take precautions to avoid moldy foods. Mold can grow on bread, soft cheese, grain, meats, dairy foods, fruits and vegetables. Throw these moldy foods out!

Q: Many people deep-fried their turkey over the holidays; are there any advantages?

A: Probably the biggest reason this method is so popular is that the turkey cooks relative fast, three to five minutes per pound in a deep fat fryer. There are many risk factors that also need to be considered.

Ginger beef soup makes dinner easy

This Asian-inspired main-dish soup can be on the table in just 15 minutes, using ground beef, ginger, broth, instant ramen noodles and frozen vegetables.

GINGER BEEF AND NOODLE SOUP

(Total preparation and cooking time 15 minutes)
1 pound lean ground beef
1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon pepper
2 cups water
13 3/4 to 14 1/2-ounce can ready-to-serve vegetable broth
3-ounce package beef-flavored instant ramen noodles, broken up
3 cups frozen broccoli stir-fry vegetable mixture

In Dutch oven or large saucepan, brown ground beef over medium heat 6 minutes or

until outside surface is no longer pink, breaking up into 3/4-inch crumbles. Pour off drippings.

Add salt, ginger and pepper. Stir in water, broth and seasoning packet from ramen noodles; bring to a boil.

Stir in noodles and vegetables; return to a boil. Continue cooking 2 to 3 minutes or until noodles are tender. Makes 4 servings (serving size about 1 1/2 cups).

by at least two inches of the fat.

■ You need a thermometer to monitor the oil temperature and the turkey temperature.

■ Select a safe place to do this type of cooking. The high temperature could start a fire.

Q: What is Vitamin B-6 and what does it do?
A: Vitamin B-6 is a water-soluble vitamin and helps use protein to build body tissue and aids in the metabolism of fat. Vitamin B-6 can be lost in preparation, cooking or storage. To retain this vitamin, serve fruits raw, cook in a minimal amount of water for the shortest time and roast or broil meat and poultry. Bananas, dried prunes,

watermelon, potatoes, spinach, chicken, turkey, ground beef, cod and canned salmon are all good sources of Vitamin B-6. Ready-to-eat and instant prepared cereals are generally fortified with Vitamin B-6.

Q: Does mustard lose its intensity (flavor) over time?

A: It is possible for the flavor of mustard to change, especially if it dries out. To rectify this, add a little vinegar, wine or water, stir and refrigerate. If it is fresh mustard, it may lose its "bite" after a couple of days. Ground mustard seeds or mustard powder has very little aroma; when added to a liquid and allowed to stand, though, it becomes quite hot so both of these can be added to give mustard a better flavor.

Q: How do you ripen a pineapple?

A: You can't ripen a pineapple at home, so it's important to

choose one in prime condition. When a pineapple is ripe, they are golden yellow, orange yellow or reddish brown depending on the variety. Check out how easy the spikes or leaves can be pulled out from the top.

Choose one that is heavy for its size, avoid one with a dull, yellowish green color that is bruised, moldy or has an unpleasant smell. A "too green" pineapple will be fibrous and not very sweet. Take your time to check on the freshness of the pineapple to make sure you get a perfect one.



SAUTÉED MUSHROOMS WITH CHIPOTLE AND GARLIC TACOS

- 1 pound medium crimini or white mushrooms, halved, sliced
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil, divided
- 1 sweet onion, quartered, sliced
- 2 large cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1/2 tablespoon chopped chipotle chile in adobo (canned) or to taste

CHICKEN WITH TOMATILLO SAUCE TACOS

- 8 ounces fresh tomatillos or 1 can (13 ounces) tomatillos, drained (found at produce markets like Nino Salvaggio's or Randazzo's)
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 tablespoon finely chopped jalapeño pepper
- 1 sweet onion, coarsely chopped
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil, divided
- 2 large cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 3 boneless chicken breast halves, about 1 pound, cut in 1/2-inch dice
- 1/3 cup chicken broth
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
- 12 corn tortillas, warmed

For fresh tomatillos, cover with water; bring to boil, add one teaspoon salt. Reduce heat; simmer until tender, about 10 minutes, then drain.

Purée cooked or canned tomatillos and jalapeño in food processor or blender; reserve. Over medium heat, sauté onion in oil until tender, about 5 minutes. Stir in garlic; sauté one minute. Raise heat to medium-high; stir in chicken. Cook, stirring constantly, until chicken is opaque, about two minutes. Stir in reserved tomatillo purée and broth. Cook, stirring constantly, until sauce thickens, about five minutes. Add more salt to taste, if desired. Stir in cilantro. Serve in tortillas. Makes about 3 cups

SHRIMP AND SWEET ONION WITH CHILIES AND LIME

- 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 tablespoon finely chopped jalapeño pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1-1/2 pounds small raw shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 1 lemon, sliced
- 1 large, firm-ripe avocado, about 8 ounces
- 1 sweet onion, diced
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
- Tortilla chips

For dressing, whisk together lemon juice, jalapeño, cumin and salt.

Whisk in oil; reserve. In a saucepan, cover shrimp and lemon with water. Bring to boil; turn off heat.

Let shrimp stand three minutes.

Drain, then cool quickly in iced water; drain immediately. (Do not let shrimp soak; they will absorb water.) Cool to room temperature.

Cut avocado into one-quarter-inch dice; fold into shrimp with reserved dressing and onion. Shrimp may be cooked up to the day before; dish may be assembled and refrigerated several hours before serving.

Just before serving, fold in cilantro.

Accompany with tortilla chips. Makes 8 appetizer servings

Bloomfield and people absolutely loved it," he said. "The ingredients are simple but, as with any appetizer, it's labor intensive."

Or he makes Rumaki — chicken liver wrapped in pre-cooked bacon either with or without chestnuts. If serving guests mainly sampler foods, estimate that each guest will eat a minimum of four to six of each type every hour. So if there are three options, the average guest will eat about 12 each hour.

"Unless you have shrimp, then they'll go wild over it and eat more," he said.

Connie Smigielski of Connie's Catering in Plymouth said party hosts should remember to keep the food easy to eat. She serves finger food at Super Bowl parties like "two-biters" which are mini tacos: tiny taco shells stuffed with beans or meat.

"On Super Bowl Sunday people like food they can grab and eat without sitting down," Smigielski said. "They're standing and talking and milling about watching the game."

"Just don't forget the beer."

Lentils help take chill out of winter

January is prime soup season. A steaming pot of soup on a cold winter's day warms the soul and nourishes the body. It will fill you up and fill your home with appealing fragrance.

Putting together a pot of soup doesn't have to be an all-day project, and some of the most healthful soups take the least time to prepare.

The place to start is with lentils. Unlike many dried beans and legumes, lentils cook quickly because they don't require soaking. Health experts love lentils because they are rich in vitamins, minerals, dietary fiber and the phytochemicals that help protect your body from cancer and other chronic diseases. A standard, one-half cup serving of lentils contains six to eight grams of fiber and so much protein that they can be used as a meat substitute.

Using lentils in dishes is also an inexpensive way to provide hearty, healthful bulk. In addition to soups, lentils are used in salads, dips, stews, and as toppings for whole grains like rice or couscous.

Lentils are ethnically diverse, popular in many parts of Europe, India and the Middle East. Brown lentils are used in hearty peasant stews and tiny green lentils are a French delicacy. Before cooking, pick through them and remove debris and any broken or discolored lentils. Rinse them


under cold water and place them in a pan along with a bay leaf and enough water or broth to cover by one inch. Cover and bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to low and simmer 10 to 20 minutes, adding more liquid as necessary, until they are just tender. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

When cooked right, lentils are chewy yet tender, with the kind of mouth-feel and flavor we expect from comfort foods. If overcooked, they may become mushy.

In this Italian-inspired recipe, lentils, fresh vegetables and some olive oil are cooked with pasta to make a satisfying, nutritious soup that will warm any January day.

ITALIAN LENTIL STEW

- 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil
- 1 medium carrot, finely chopped (about 1 cup)
- 1 small onion, finely chopped (about 1 cup)
- 1 cup diced fennel
- 1 1/2 cups green or small brown lentils
- 1/2 cup finely-chopped flat-leaf parsley
- 1/2-1 teaspoon basil
- 1/2-1 teaspoon marjoram
- 1/2-1 teaspoon chopped dried chives
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 1/3 cup small pasta
- 6 cups water

Lentils, fresh vegetables and olive oil are cooked with pasta to create this Italian inspired dish that can be served as a soup or stew.

In a small Dutch oven or 3-quart saucepan, heat the oil over medium high heat.

Stir in the carrot, onion and fennel and cook 3 minutes, stirring occasionally, just to soften the vegetables slightly.

Add the lentils and 6 cups water. Stir in parsley, basil, marjoram and chives. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer for 30 minutes, uncovered.

Stir in the salt, pepper and pasta. Cook until the pasta is done and the lentils are soft, 10 to 15 minutes. Add more water, stirring it in gradually until mixture is desired consistency. Adjust seasonings and add more herbs if desired.

This dish can also be served as

a soup, depending on the amount of water used. At this point, the stew (or soup) can be served, or stored in the refrigerator or freezer.

Makes 8 servings if served as a stew, more if thinned to a soup.

Here's how to photograph in cold weather

For those of you who live in cold climates or for those who live in the South but travel to snow country, winter photography can reward you

with fabulous shots for your photo album. But cold weather photography can present you with some problems that make shooting more difficult than during fair weather.

While photographers who live in a very cold climate are accustomed to such conditions, anyone used to more temperate weather can get caught unprepared.

Before setting off to take photographs in very cold conditions, you should spend some time preparing your equipment and your own clothing. Almost any camera can be operated normally to about zero degrees, but at temperatures lower than this, difficulties may start to occur.

Why do cameras function less efficiently in the cold? The most common reason is loss of battery power. Batteries not only operate the metering system, but also operate the shutter on most newer cameras. Batteries work by chemical reactions which always proceed more slowly at lower temperatures. Solution: Keep the battery in your pocket until just ready to shoot. Take your shots, then place the battery back in your pocket to keep it warm. There are precautions you


should take, too, for photographing in very cold weather. Dress warmly, in layers, and make sure your clothing allows easy access to cameras and lenses. Wear two pairs of gloves: a heavy outer pair and a thin inner pair. Remove the outer gloves when you're ready to shoot. The thin pair will keep your hands warm yet will enable you to work all camera controls.

In cold weather, you must take special care with your film. Because it can become brittle, advance it carefully and slowly as you run through the roll (turn off your power-winder) and rewind it carefully, too.

Besides the physical problems of working in low temperatures, there are other considerations, a major one being exposure. Snow-covered scenery is quite different from the average scene and the meter can be fooled. Remember that all meters are programmed to read average gray, so with snow scenes, be sure to overexpose a stop or two in order to produce a good negative.

When you come in from the cold, pay special attention to your camera.

Water vapor in a heated room condenses on cold metal and glass surfaces and your camera will become covered with moisture. No damage will be done, just be sure to wipe off your camera.

The new book on Motown is a slow read on music minutiae

MOTOWN: MUSIC, MONEY, SEX, AND POWER

By Gerald Posner (Random House, \$24.95)

really don't think it's just my imagination that much of this book, penned by the investigative journalist/historian Gerald Posner, is hard going.

By that, I don't mean it's difficult to read or understand; I mean that it's slow as molasses in January — unless you might happen to be a recording executive or involved in the business somehow.

Though Posner brings us many of the facts of the rise and fall of Detroit's historic Hitsville USA, he ultimately fails to bring

that history to life. And there's really not a whole lot that's new on these pages, either.

As to plodding details, I doubt that most readers will be particularly interested, for instance, in finding out the names and backgrounds of every member of Berry Gordy's promotion team back in the 60's, along with the sales department, and some of the most obscure artists. There's some pretty excruciating minutiae here, too, about the ultimate and complex sale of Motown, plus the numerous lawsuits filed against Motown by performers who considered their contracts financially unfair. (According to Posner, "The bulk of those legal files are crammed into multiple steel cabinets in the basement of the Wayne County Court in downtown Detroit. Some lawsuits over royalty disputes that arose in the 1960s are still pending...")

Not surprisingly, the lead player in this chapter of pop culture is Berry Gordy himself, the Detroit native who founded Motown, bringing a new "crossover" sound to the American scene, and eventually developing some of the brightest stars in musical history—Diana Ross and the Supremes, Michael Jackson, Stevie Wonder, the Temptations, and Marvin Gaye, to name a few.

Before the Motown label existed, a few small recording companies like JVB and Sensation struggled to survive in Detroit. But, not long after Gordy obtained an \$800 loan from his close-knit family to start the business he would eventually sell (to Boston Ventures and MCA) for \$61 million, these companies pretty much faded away.

In his early days, Gordy struggled to find a career niche. He served a stint in the Army, took

up boxing, worked for his father's contracting business, toiled on the Ford assembly line, and finally began to try his hand at songwriting (though he had never had any formal musical training, and still hasn't). He hung out often at Detroit's Flame Show Bar, where he met the club's owner, Al Green, and young talents like the flamboyant Jackie Wilson. As it happened, Green owned a music publishing company, and soon "BG" was one of its songwriters.

Eventually, he was writing and producing songs, and had obtained the loan from his family to start his own label. In 1959, he purchased (for \$25,000) the rather plain-looking house at 2648 West Grand Boulevard that would become the headquarters for Hitsville USA.

He ran the business something like a benign, paternalistic dictator, and modeled it after

some of the assembly line procedures he'd witnessed while he was employed at Ford Motor Company.

For Berry Gordy, the bottom line was seemingly always the top priority.

And for those on its payroll, being a part of Motown was, in many ways, like being part of a large family. Gordy even hired a cook to put together generous and unpretentious meals in the kitchen for any and all employees.

"You wouldn't think twice about pitching in to help with whatever had to be done," according to the Temptations' Otis Williams, "whether it was singing backgrounds or mopping the floor."

Posner adds, "On any given day, a visitor...might find Pops Gordy doing some repair on the house, or Smokey Robinson cutting the grass." Things changed, of course,

and drastically, as Motown grew more and more successful.

Finally, the business outgrew its little home on Grand Boulevard and moved into comparatively cold and generic offices downtown. Then, Gordy fell in love with the sunshine of California, and moved the business there, repeated and costly litigation had to be dealt with and, simply put, Motown matters apparently became too much for him to oversee the way he'd always tried to.

Ever the gambler, Gordy saw himself as a winner of sorts in the end, however, even though he had to give up Motown in order to save it.

"From \$800 to \$61 million, I had done it," he once commented about the sale, "I had won the poker hand."





A spa that's not just for the rich and famous

Nestled high in the Sierra Madres and 1 1/2 hours from Mexico City is a spa that offers the ultimate in relaxation.

This reasonably priced retreat, Hotel Spa Ixtapan, has 200 comfortable rooms and 50 villas surrounded by 35 acres of lush gardens.

The surroundings, as it turned out, were refreshing.

Colorful blossoms filled the trees and bushes, and the grounds were littered with bright orange, fuchsia, lavender and white petals. A Las Vegas pool with a tiered waterfall, a second pool, large outdoor whirlpool, multicolored fountains, and mosaic murals portraying Mexico's history are comfortably situated in a climate of 75 degrees year-round.

Legend has it that Ixtapan de la Sal, the village where the spa is located, was a retreat discovered and used by Aztec Emperor Montezuma. Here he rested with his troops and bathed in the natural thermal waters. Today it has expanded into a complete spa resort with three programs called diet, relax and sport. Each offers a

slightly different mix of massages, facials and other treatments, which include pedicures, hair treatments, paraffin and acupuncture. Activities that are part of the various programs are aerobics, golf and tennis lessons. A sauna, steam-room, whirlpool and a fully equipped gymnasium are available to all guests.

The spa diet dining room offers a 900-calorie per day diet; the sparse meals are devoid of spices and herbs. Veteran guests bring a selection of seasonings from home to spice up the food. The main dining room offers more menu choices, including guacamole, salsa, fruit, great rolls and desserts.

Visitors can choose either a four-day or seven-day stay ranging from \$535 to \$1075 per person, double occupancy depending on choice of program and season (tax, tips, and airport transfers are extra). Selecting the plan with activities that best suits your interests, then select the dining room with a menu appeals to you.


Ixtapan offers the same programs as the "fancier" spas at about one fifth the cost, including airfare from any major U.S. city.

Although golf, tennis and spa activities are offered for men, this is a place for women to bond and let their hair down, literally.

This is a spa for the veteran spa-goer and the uninitiated alike. Don't worry about wardrobe and lack of "proper spa etiquette." The dress code is very casual.

In fact, much of the time is spent in thick terrycloth robes (provided by the spa), bathing suits, shorts and tee shirts. Most clothing, except shorts and swimsuits, is acceptable in the evening.

Ixtapan is a place for rejuvenation of body and spirit where even the most frenzied will find themselves relaxing and dozing during a massage or facial.

WALKING AND MORE

In a typical spa day, you might take advantage of the hour-long guided walks that start promptly at 7 a.m. The symphony of singing birds is enough to lift anyone's spirits. We walked through nearby villages, passing ancient and heavily churches, beautiful golden hills, and local farmers walking their cattle past simple adobe dwellings. We witnessed the rising sun silhouetting 400-year-old gazebos, and townspeople going about their early morning chores. Walk and you will see the "real" Mexico.

After walking, consider an hour of aerobic exercise, breakfast and aquatic exercise in the pool. Follow this with a facial, (a fruit or vegetable yogurt mask and a spritz of rosewater); lunch on the terrace, acupuncture, body massage and yoga session. On the diet program you are entitled to a manicure, pedicure and hair treatment. The hair treatment is spectacular and includes a head, neck and shoulder massage.

The relax program offers six Roman mineral baths. These individual rooms accommodate one or two people. The attractive marble-walled rooms contain two cots, a large marble-lined pool with bubbling hot water, a shower in the bathroom and pleasant music.

Guests are mostly from all parts of the U.S. who have heard about the spa by word of mouth. Some arrange to have an annual reunion with friends. The atmosphere is friendly; guests and staff are most congenial.

There's a shop on the grounds plus several shops adjacent to the Roman baths and stalls just outside the walls of the spa. The stalls are most active on weekends. Prices are very reasonable, but shoppers can bargain to save a few dollars.

WALK INTO TOWN

Had enough relaxing? Take the short pleasant walk into

Ixtapan de la Sal.

It is clean, safe and a journey back in time. The locals' Ixtapan is down the hill from the big church courtyard. Seeing the farmers' market early on Saturday morning is a refreshing reminder of how a tight-knit community looks and sounds.

Farmacia Madrid, near the big 16th century church, is a must-see. Be sure to go inside to see the side altar decorated with stunning murals, gold-decorated walls and stain glass scenes.

On Sunday, there's a flea market with pottery, silver jewelry, baskets, clothes and other wares.

Evening activities include movies, bingo, bowling and on weekends, live dinner music, folkloric ballet and a disco. Side trips to Cuernavaca and Taxco can be arranged by the hotel desk.

If your stress level and/or your waistline need reducing, then this is the place for you.

If you go ...

■ Flights are offered to Mexico City from most major cities, some with a change of planes. For information call Spa World Reservations at 800-321-4622, go to www.spaget-away.com and click on Ixtapan de la Sal Packages.

■ Your travel agent can arrange with the hotel for car transportation from Mexico City to Ixtapan. Ask the hotel to arrange for you to share a car with other guests arriving at the same time, so you can share the cost.


■ Go to Taxco for silver jewelry bargains; just a one-hour car trip. Try arranging to share a car with other guests.

■ Bring sunglasses, sunscreen and Imodium or Pepto Bismol.

■ Tipping: Although cumbersome, bring \$5 bills and at least 30 \$1 bills.

■ Take in the Roman baths for around \$8 (no charge on the Relax plan).

■ Go the second half of the week for four days, if time and budget are concerns. On weekends there are more activities, including dinner music, disco, folkloric ballet, lighted fountains and more shops at the flea market.



The final score was 100-85, improving Canton's overall dual-meet record to 3-2. The Chiefs are 2-0 in the WLAA, 1-0 in the division.


"We swam pretty well," said Canton coach Ed Weber. "We expected to win, just by looking at their other results, so we got to swim some people in different-type events."

The Chiefs swim at Wayne Memorial Thursday. Last Thursday, Salem had no problem







Beaumont Eye Institute offers vision rehabilitation

Mary Ann Scheele, a Redford Township senior, thought she'd be in the dark forever after she lost most of her vision following a stroke last spring. Fortunately, she made an appointment with Dr. Susan Hahn, an optometrist with the Beaumont Eye Institute for a low-vision evaluation. Hahn referred her to Manjula Amarnath, an occupational therapist at Beaumont Hospital and a specialist in visual rehabilitation.

After months of therapy, Scheele is seeing a lot better.

"I'm able to watch TV and go out with my friends. I can read a little if I have the right light," she said.


It's all about learning to track, said Scheele. "Before I just moved my head and not my eyes. Now, rather than feeling for an object, I locate it with my eyes then reach. The brain and the eyes have to get together in this business."

Exactly, said Amarnath, who recalled that Scheele had to be led in the room by her daughter-in-law, Catherine, during her first therapy session. "Her eyes were fixed and she wouldn't move her eyes to locate anything."

A vision-impaired person cannot "see" unless what he or she sees is correctly interpreted by the brain, she added.

Amarnath soon had Scheele using her eyes to track a moving object, catch a swinging ball, and write and read by using her finger as a guide. She would give Scheele instructions as to an object's location, thus setting up a tracking route. She also gave Scheele homework. Scheele proved to be an eager student.

"It was amazing, really a pleasure to work with her," said Amarnath. "Every time I gave her a task she'd

work on it, and when she came back we could move on."

Unfortunately, Scheele's Medicare benefits have run out and she is now confined to doing her therapy at home.

NEW LIFE

Scheele has a new appreciation for the little pleasures in life, even though they may come with a few pitfalls.


"I made Swiss steak one night and pounded the flour in it. My daughter-in-law put it in the pressure cooker. My son came out of his office and slid across the floor because I had gotten flour all over the floor," she said. (Scheele's son and daughter-in-law came to live with her after her stroke.)

"It has been a great, great improvement," she added. "I can't say enough about my occupational therapist. She has such concern and compassion. She teaches you so well."

Scheele's sight is not perfect. Her vision is still foggy, still kind of gray, she said. "But I can see the kids when they sit down. I can see my son sitting there. He has a mustache and a goatee."

Scheele's family has benefited from Scheele's improved vision. "My life is a lot easier," said Catherine, who had to physically guide her mother-in-law around the house. "It's given our family a lot of hope. Her life is changed. She's able to sing in the church choir again."

"She's doing very well and probably could be doing better if I let her walk by herself more," Catherine added. "We've gone from mom saying, 'I'm blind' to

mom saying, 'I'm visually impaired.' There's much less stigma."

EVALUATION

Not everybody with low vision can be taught to "see" once again, said Hahn, who usually refers patients with vision loss from stroke or brain injury to Amarnath.

"Sometimes, it can be retaught, sometimes we can't regain everything we have lost. Visual field



loss is not usually something that is regained. The patient must learn compensating skills."

According to the Neuro-Optometric Rehabilitation Association, visual field loss occurs in many forms, from nearly complete loss of peripheral vision to small areas of partial loss. Patients who suffer strokes or other traumatic brain injuries to one side of the brain, including tumors, may develop a loss of visual field to the opposite side.

"Patients often mistake this as being a bad right eye or left eye, but it actually occurs in the brain and thus presents as a loss in both eyes. Patients often run into objects, lose their place in reading and are startled by people or objects moving at them suddenly from the lost field," according to NORA Scheele has recently been tested by her ophthalmologist for visual field loss and is awaiting the findings. Based on the test results, it's possible Hahn will recommend more occupational therapy.

All that depends on Medicare approval, said Catherine. Benefits for low vision therapy were cut from six months to two months.

"After just two months, she started to get her confidence," said Catherine. "It's really a shame. We should be able to get the care these people need. It's important to continue their therapy. You pay all this money - all of us pay it - and I just see how far she's come. I just hope she'll be able to pick up and continue."

Meanwhile, Scheele continues with her exercises at home. And if she occasionally spread peanut butter on the counter while making herself a sandwich, so be it.

"I never thought I'd see again," she said. "I thought I always would be in the dark."

THE OLD WAYS CAN STILL BE THE BEST WAYS

Every day we hear about the results of technology in medicine. An example is the announcement of a new type of coronary stent that will not clot. Just 3 years ago, stents were a novelty.

You are not out of line, to expect that such progress goes on everywhere in medicine. That is not true, in fact, this column will devote itself to praise soap and water. If you need to heal a leg ulcer, nothing yet betters soap and water, combined with patience and time.

If this is to work it must be done in a particular manner, and you must get to the leg ulcer as soon as possible. The ulcer should be cleaned three times a day by placing it under the spigot of the bath tub. Then let water, at a warm and comfortable temperature, flow over the ulcer. During this time, squirt a small amount of liquid soap over the ulcer. Do not scrub the skin, let the water wash off the soap. After 5 minutes of washing in this way, let the ulcer air dry. Then cover it with a clean 4x4 gauze. You need not have the gauze sterile, that is an unnecessary expense. Cover the gauze with a kerlix wrap applied gently around the leg; use a piece of tape to bind the ends of the wrap.

Repeat this procedure three times a day and do it every day. This approach works by keeping the skin free of ointments and salves that macerate the skin, using gentle means to keep the skin free of germs, and through air drying, giving the tissue cells an incentive to grow.

Yes, you do have dust mites in your home

What are dust mites?

Dust mites are tiny bugs that live your house. They measure about 1/100th of an inch in length, which is smaller than the period at the end of this sentence. They are a major cause of allergies and asthma. When some children are exposed to dust mites, their asthma symptoms appear for the first time. If children already have asthma, dust mites can make them wheeze more.

What do I do first?

Start in the bedroom. Most of the dust mites in your house live in your mattress. Put an airtight plastic or polyurethane cover over your mattress. Wash your sheets and blankets in very hot water every week or put a plastic cover on it. (The pillowcase goes over the plastic cover.)

The water used to wash your sheets and blankets should be 130 degrees. This temperature is higher than you may want for your water heater, because water over 120 can burn children if they turn on the hot water by themselves. If you don't want to set your water heater at this temperature, you can wash your sheets and blankets at commercial laundries.

Your bedroom should have a hardwood, tile or linoleum floor instead of carpet. Dust mites can grow rapidly in carpet. If you must use carpet, try not to place in on concrete because the warm space between a rug and concrete is a good place for mites to live.

I don't want to rip out my carpet. Is there anything I can do to treat it?

You can spray the rug with a solution of 3 percent tannic acid every two months to kill

the dust mites. Ask your doctor if this solution will be helpful.

What else can I do?


Vacuuming your carpets and upholstery every week can help. Vacuums with high-efficiency filters pick up more dust mites, but even standard vacuums work well enough.

Plastic or wood furniture that doesn't have much padding can also help keep down the number of dust mites in your home. Because dust mites love warm, humid places, keeping the humidity low by using a dehumidifier and running your air conditioner makes a difference. Special air filters can help reduce dust mites in the air.

Habitat's Global Village shows how poor live around world

(AP) - The green and brown house on stilts in south Georgia may look like a glorified tree-house, but it's actually the type of home Habitat for Humanity volunteers build for poor families in Papua New Guinea.

"We get deer hunters come by who want one as a deer stand," says Habitat spokeswoman Carla Robinson.

"Part of what we're trying to do is educate people about how others live overseas. We're so blessed as a country that what is a mansion to someone in the developing world is recreation for us."

The New Guinea house is one of 40 that are built or planned at Habitat's 6-acre Global Village & Discovery Center, designed to help the Americus-based group build awareness, encourage volunteers and bring tourists to southwest Georgia.

Construction began last January, and so far hundreds of volunteers from 68 countries have built 15 homes, typical of Habitat homes in places such

as Sri Lanka, Guatemala, Tanzania, Haiti and Botswana. The \$5 million village will open in the spring, but construction will continue for two more years.

Visitors will see examples of Third World slums, where millions of poor live without electric lights, toilets or even a roof that doesn't leak.

Then they can tour Habitat homes from around the world. The center will also feature an exhibition center with photos and videos.

"It's important for Americans to see how 1.2 billion people live," says Habitat spokeswoman Kimberly Moore. "About one-fourth of the world's population lives in poverty."

Visitors also will be able to make bricks and roofing tiles or they can see how New Guinea residents weave mats for their homes.

They can even make a contribution by buying a \$100 brick with their name inscribed on it,

or a front yard or even an entire house at Third World prices, usually less than \$5,000.

"They're more than welcome to give more than that," says Millard Fuller, who founded Habitat with his wife, Linda, in 1976. "We have had tremendous support for this project."

Fuller says the Global Village funds are separate from the money Habitat uses to finance its poverty housing programs.

With affiliates in more than 3,000 communities in 87 countries, the Christian housing ministry has built more than 125,000 homes around the world.

The contact number for Habitat for Humanity in western Wayne County is (734) 459-7744, for Oakland County, (248) 338-1843.

Habitat's international headquarters, located in the southwest Georgia town of Americus, about 150 miles south of Atlanta, attracts more than 10,000 visitors a year.

Over the years, visitors were

most impressed by a small group of houses, displayed inside an old warehouse, depicting the group's international work, Fuller says.

"That was the thing they talked about," Fuller said. "I began to realize we needed something that was bigger. We launched a fund-raising campaign and got commitments for more than \$700,000."

Habitat spent about \$140,000 clearing land that had been occupied by a dilapidated peanut mill and now is in the process of building the village. The volunteer builders use native materials as much as possible.

"Most people don't get to go to India or to walk through a neighborhood in Kenya or Botswana," Fuller says. "We're giving you an opportunity. These houses are very authentic. We think it's going to be inspirational."

Former President Jimmy Carter and his wife, Rosalynn, whose home is about 20 miles

west of Americus, are long-time friends of Fuller and have been the group's most high-profile volunteers.

The tourist train that stops at the Global Village continues west to the Carters' hometown of Plains and then on to Carter's boyhood home in Archery.

Jimmy Carter became the nation's 39th president and won the Nobel Peace prize this year for his global peacemaking efforts.

During a recent preview for Americus residents, volunteers and reporters, Gera Nelson of Brazil was cooking plantains, eaten as a vegetable throughout the tropics, in a brick stove inside an tin-roof African house made from concrete blocks.

"Anywhere in Africa, if a person can get a tin roof, that makes them happy," says Nelson who has worked on some of Habitat's international projects.

Patrick Nwokedi of Nigeria showed visitors a Ghanaian

home. It, too, was made from concrete blocks, but its white paint and light blue trim gave it a more cheerful look than some of the unpainted dwellings.

Nwokedi said Habitat homes change people's lives in Africa.

"It makes them happy they have their heads under a roof," he said. "They are able to live happily and send their children to school. There are a lot of people who are poor and don't have their own houses."

Speaking at the groundbreaking for the Global Village earlier in 2002, Carter said, "Rosalynn and I have had an opportunity to see what Habitat is doing around the world."

"We have been to Nicaragua, where we have made roof tiles. We have worked in the Philippines, Mexico and South Korea."

"The Global Village & Discovery Center will give a better sense of what Habitat is doing, not only at home, but around the world," Carter said.

Development fight touches near historic battlefield

(AP) - Skirmishes between developers and Civil War buffs seeking to preserve battlefields are common in northern Virginia, a rapidly growing area that was also the epicenter of the Civil War.

But now a full-fledged national battle has erupted over a proposal to build a new town called Chancellorsville on the land that gave Confederate Gen. Robert E. Lee his greatest victory.

"This is not somebody's garden back yard. This is a piece of land of national significance," said James Lighthizer, president of the Civil War Preservation Trust.

That organization has worked to preserve 15,000 acres of Civil War battlefield over the years.

Preservationists from around the country have unleashed 10,000 letters, phone calls and e-mails on Spotsylvania County's seven-member board, which is to make the final decision on the development soon.

"Chancellorsville is a national name, right up there with Gettysburg, Antietam, Vicksburg," said Jim Campi, a spokesman for the trust. "A lot of times people become involved in these fights because of environmental concerns. In this case, both locally and nationally, a lot of people are involved because of the history."

Recently, voters in the county dis-

trict that includes the battlefield elected a new supervisor who opposes the development.

He won with 64 percent of the vote and says the development was "absolutely the overriding issue" in the campaign.

"Nationally, the issue is preservation of the battlefield," Campi said. "Locally, the issue is quality of life. We just don't have the water capacity, we don't have the road capacity to support this development."

The 1863 Battle of Chancellorsville is a textbook example of military ingenuity. Gen. Norman Schwartzkopf cited the battle as inspiration for his plans during the Persian Gulf War.

Lee's outnumbered troops defeated Union forces in a three-day battle that resulted in 30,000 casualties on both sides. Among them was Confederate Gen. Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson, who died after his own troops accidentally shot him.

The victory emboldened Lee to invade Union territory, leading to his defeat at Gettysburg a few months later.

Developer Ray Smith of Dogwood Development Group in suburban Washington, D.C., initially proposed a 2,350-home development with about 2 million square feet of commercial space - roughly the equivalent of 10 Wal-Mart stores - on an 800-acre parcel.

He since has scaled back his plans to include 1,995 homes.

The development is proposed for land next to the existing national park that preserves land from the Chancellorsville battlefield and from other nearby battles, including Fredericksburg, Spotsylvania Courthouse and Wilderness.

There is no current town of Chancellorsville, nor has there ever been. In 1863, Chancellorsville was merely a crossroads and a tavern.

But Smith envisions his new town looking like those that dotted Virginia in Civil War times, self-sufficient, with residents living in homes inspired by 19th-century architecture, able to walk to schools and shops in a town center.

The development would also include three hotels and other tourist-friendly amenities that Smith says would boost attendance at the existing national battlefield park, which has been declining in recent years.

In addition, Smith said his plan would preserve about 55 acres that are the most historically significant on the parcel and make it a battlefield park.

Under the existing zoning, that portion of the land is already zoned for commercial development.

"The preservationists have stirred people up, but I'm not quite sure why," Smith said. "Where the fighting

happened, we're preserving it."

Lighthizer accused Smith of distorting history to make his development sound more palatable.

Lighthizer said the new town would completely overwhelm the scene of the first day of fighting, put the existing national park under further development pressure and spoil scenic views.

Lighthizer's group commissioned a poll showing that 66 percent of county residents opposed the development. At a recent public hearing, more than 300 people attended, with speakers equally divided between supporters and detractors.

Smith disputed the poll's findings, and said a majority of county residents support the project because of the potential to add millions of dollars to the tax base of a county that is growing rapidly and needs to pay for new schools and other services demanded by residents.

Sandy Rives, a spokesman for the National Park Service, said the park is concerned that the development will increase traffic on a busy highway that cuts through the battlefield, a fear Smith says is unfounded.

But Rives said he is optimistic that a solution can be reached.

"Are there ways the project can continue and the battlefield can be protected? I think there is a way to figure something out," he said.





Upgraded facade elevates look of 3-bedroom ranch

Programmable thermostat, right-size furnace save money

When it's cold outside, you want it to be warm inside, but without breaking the bank. In the past, I have discussed the merits of insulation, sealing air leaks and other basic tips that help save money on your energy bill. But additionally, there are two big things you can do to keep your bill lower and your house warmer — install a programmable thermostat and the most efficient, properly sized furnace for your home. What most people don't realize is that for every degree lower you set your thermostat, you save 3 percent on your energy bill. So just by lowering your thermostat from 72 °F to 70°F, you save 6 percent on your bill — and programmable thermostats take the work out of that task for you. You can save around \$30 to \$40 annually, which is just about

what they cost. So that cost can be recouped within a year of installation. These thermostats will turn down the heat when you are away from your home or sleeping, whatever pattern and temperatures you choose. The second thing is a bit larger, your furnace. Most people think the furnace they have is the right size for their home, but that isn't always true. The size of a furnace needed for a home shouldn't be determined by square footage or by simply matching the size of the existing furnace. The only way to know for sure is for the contractor to do a heat loss/heat gain calculation. The calculation takes things like windows, doors, insulation and your basement into consideration and figures out the proper size furnace. And bigger isn't better. If your furnace is too big for your home, it will heat your home too quickly and then shutoff too quickly, which leads to hot and cold cycles of 10 minutes. I like to call it the 10 minute on - 10 minute off sweater cycle. It's easy to tell if your furnace


is the right size for your house. On a 30°F day (approximately), your furnace should run in about 15-minute cycles. If it runs less than 15 minutes, it is probably too big. So when it's time to buy a new furnace, make sure your contractor uses a heat loss/heat gain calculation. One last thing. When you buy a new furnace, buy the most energy-efficient model you can afford. The efficiencies will pay for the higher cost of the more efficient furnace. One thing to keep in mind is that the new high-efficiency furnaces are designed to run for longer periods of time and blow air that is cooler than older, less efficient furnaces. This will increase the comfort level in your house. Please note that your electric bill may increase slightly, but your gas bill will decrease by a greater amount and is worth it. 
Driven this week was the LX model. The line-up includes a coupe and convertible models as well.

I especially liked the mileage numbers on the Sebring - between 20 mpg in the city and up to 30 mpg on the highway, depending on the model and the way it's equipped. For a car with this price tag, your daily commute just might become fun again.




