Canton water bills expected to jump

Canton residents can expect to see an increase in their water bills come July 1; nothing new there, since rates have risen each year for the past several vears.

How much of an increase hasn't been determined yet, according to John Spencer, accountant in the township's finance and budget department.

"It may be close to 9 or 10 percent, only because we have to pass costs along," he said.

The Detroit Water and Sewerage Department is raising the wholesale rates it charges suburban communities to help pay for a \$4.3 billion project to improve the system. The department is in the third year of the five-year project.

For Canton, the wholesale rate is being increased from \$12.15 per thousand cubic feet to \$13.27, an increase of 9.2 percent.

Spencer said the current \$12.15 cost per thousand cubic feet translates to \$1.71 per thousand gallons. Customers are billed \$2 per thousand gallons.

"The difference is our local cost in maintaining our water division," he said. For sewer costs, Canton residents pay \$3.06 per

thousand gallons. Spencer said there are three components in the wholesale rates for sewage disposal and treatment.

"There's the City of Detroit sewage rate," he said. "Also Wayne County operates the sewer system that gets the sewage from us to Detroit's treatment plant." Then the township contracts with the Western

Townships Utilities Authority to the Ypsilanti Community Utilities Authority treatment plant. Spencer said the costs for Detroit and Wayne County combined is \$8.43 per thousand cubic feet.

The YCUA rate is \$8.66 per thousand cubic feet. "We average those to get our actual local costs," he said.


Author wows luncheon crowd



Patterson bill makes history as first to be signed into law by Granholm

State Sen. Bruce Patterson. R-Canton Township, helped Gov. Jennifer Granholm make history earlier this month.

Patterson's Senate Bill 160 was signed into law April 3, making it the first bill signed into law by Michigan's first female governor.

"It has to do with the auditor general and restoration of subpoena powers," said Patterson. "It basically recodifies something that goes back to 1919, and adds some language that defines what is an audit and what is an examination.

"The audit tracks state dollars through agencies to make sure they're being expended the right way, and the evaluation has to do with testing and performance of programs to make sure they're doing what the Legislature intended." added Patterson. "It helps ensure we are operating in a good government fashion, and maintains some fiscal integrity."

Patterson said his bill moved swiftly through the Legislature.

"It's not the most important piece of legislation, it was just universally

embraced as something we should do," he said, "so it moved through the system

very quickly. "It's good government; nobody could argue with

that, and nobody did," said Patterson.



Maple Ridge."



school.




For a first-time event, Ashley said, the contest went pretty well, though the dealer did learn some lessons.

Plymouth Township site among those used for ash tree chipper

State agricultural officials have set up four area sites where local communities, businesses and homeowners can drop off ash trees infested by the Emerald Ash Borer.

The tiny exotic pest from Asia has devastated ash trees within a six-county area in southeast Michigan. Many cities have been busy cutting down dead and dying trees. However, to effectively kill the larvae inside the tree, the wood must be either burned or chipped.

Since most communities don't have access to chippers that can handle large logs, Michigan Department of Agriculture officials have been looking for potential drop-off sites where communities can take advantage of the state's equipment.

State officials announced they have set up initial sites in Plymouth Township, Pontiac, Macomb Township and Westland. The Plymouth Township location is on Eckles, and the owner, Asplundh Tree Expert Company, will use the property as a staging area for

Asplundh officials weren't available for comment, but Plymouth Township Supervisor Steve Mann said the township has been working with Asplundh, and is glad to have the site.

"This is a crisis, and we're happy to have them," Mann said.

According to Kendra
Anderson, the state's director
of operations for the Emerald
Ash Borer project, the four





Breakdown of water bill

Canton residents get their water bills quarterly. While the amounts vary depending on the amount of usage - going up during peak watering months in the summer - the rate is \$2 per thousand gallons for water and \$3.06 for sewer.

John Spencer, who handles accounting for the township's water division, said he estimates the average customer uses about 10,000 gallons of water per month or 30,000 per

quarter. Based on that an average bill would be \$150 per quarter, with \$60 of that being for water and \$90 for sewer.

As far as the individual customer is concerned, that translates to \$1.94 per thousand gallons in local cost for sewage disposal and treatment, 59 cents per thousand for WTUA cost and 51 cents per thousand for municipal bond costs.

"The total local cost is \$3.04 per thousand gallons," Spencer said. "We bill the local customer \$3.01."

He said Canton's water bill rates are probably in the midrange as far as other communities are concerned.

"The closer you get to Detroit the rates are a little less because they are determined by the distance from the treatment plant, the elevation and peak demand," he said.

Last year, Canton raised the

combined water and sewer rate 25 cents per thousand gallons. The previous year rates increased 21 cents and the year before that 29 cents.

For the new rates to go into effect July 1, Spencer said they would have to be adopted by the board of trustees by the first meeting in June.

"We'll probably take them to the board in May," he said.

proposed on waste

In an attempt to prevent garbage importing to Michigan landfills, U.S. Rep. John D. Dingell, ranking member of the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and a group of bipartisan representatives have introduced legislation to provide states and local communities with the ability to exercise controls over out-of-state and Canadian

Dingell praised the strong support of Gov. Jennifer Granholm as well as the governors of Ohio, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Indiana and Kentucky who today wrote to Chairman Paul Gillmor of the Subcommittee on Environment and Hazardous Waste, Committee on Energy and Commerce, asking that the legislation be marked up before the Memorial Day District Work Period.

"Mothers frequently tell their children to take care of and clean up their own messes," Dingell said, in a press release. "To the greatest extent possible, Canada and other states should follow that wise advice when disposing of their trash."

According to Dingell's office, in just five years, from 1993 to 1998, interstate waste shipments across the nation nearly doubled from 14.5 million tons to 28.4 million tons. Imports of garbage into Michigan have increased by approximately 1.7 million tons in the past four years, from 2.1 million in 1999 to 3.8 million in 2002. A significant percentage of this increase comes from the importation of Canadian waste.

Canadian imports have increased by 12 percent in the last year from 1.96 million tons to 2.2 million tons. In the last four years, Canadian imports have increased by 182 percent. Imports now represent almost 20 percent of the waste disposal in Michigan, up from 12 percent in 1999.

Dingell said imported waste itself is not the only or most significant problem.

"The thousands upon thousands of truckloads of out-of-state and Canadian waste we receive each year are delivering more to the dump than garbage. Each and every truck adds to our already congested highways, spurs new concerns over traffic safety, pollutes our air and eats up our energy, not to mention our roads," said Dingell.

Only through an act of Congress can states and localities gain the authority to control interstate waste shipments.

The Solid Waste Interstate Transportation Act of 2003 does not give states outright authority to prohibit all out-of-state trash, but rather provides tools enabling state and local governments to maintain disposal capacity for their own waste.

Among other tools, local governments will be authorized to apply a presumptive ban to out-ofstate municipal solid waste unless the landfill or incinerator obtains the agreement of the affected local government.

State governments, when issuing permits for waste facilities, will have the authority to place a cap on out-of-state waste received annually.

Additionally, states and affected local governments may limit the amount of out-of-state waste received at each landfill or incinerator to levels not to exceed calendar year 1993, or any subsequent year where records documenting outof-state waste were kept.



Holidays during wartime

Chef-instructor says Navy was 'like family'



Chef Jeff Gabriel

Jeff Gabriel, a certified master chef and instructor at Schoolcraft College, knows what it's like to serve in the military during the holidays, so he can relate to what today's armed service personnel might feel on Easter in a faraway land.

Gabriel served in the Navy from 1971-74 as a Navy cook. During holidays such as Easter, he was away from his family.

But as he tells it, he also was-

"When you're aboard ship, everybody's family," Gabriel said. "Everyone in your unit

becomes family." Gabriel served on a destroyer that supplied other destroyers and served as a floating machine shop. Gabriel occasionally saw land, but he was mainly at sea during his west Pacific duty near Thailand, the Philippines and Vietnam.

"I really didn't see a lot of land or combat," Gabriel said. "Sometimes we'd have heavy artillery when we'd have to go ashore in riverboats with supplies. My job was mainly to feed the crew and keep up morale with good food."

It's also a time where Gabriel learned to cook. He calls his time in the military a "great experience."

²I met great people," Gabriel said. "It was a good discipline for me. If it wasn't for the military, I don't know what I might be doing now. But when I served, I knew I wanted to be a chef and the GI bill helped pay for my college." Gabriel attended the Culinary Institute of

America in Hyde Park, N.Y. In the service, he also learned firsthand about holiday meals for large groups ranging between 400 to 600 people on the ship. "We prepared hot cross buns on Easter," Gabriel said. "We roasted hams and lambs. We cooked everything from scratch, including breads

He also cooked in the middle of the night for six or seven Navy Seals after they returned from their special operations.

and pastries."

"Food is very important," Gabriel said of its role in a war. "The food is one of the most important things aboard a ship. It kept them healthy and it helped morale. It was not just a nutritional thing.

"Sometimes we'd break out the steaks and, if they wanted lobster tails, we'd give them lobster tails. And you'd hear stories about what they did and what they blew up." Gabriel learned quickly how to cook several Yankee pot roasts, 30 gallons of soup and other large quantities of vegetables for the large numbers of personnel.

The ship had three kitchens with about six or seven cooks for about 800. The captain had his own "mess," or kitchen and chef, and the officers also had a chef.

And during battle, everyone went to battle stations, sometimes for up to 12 hours, Gabriel said. "It was critical that you couldn't leave your battle stations," Gabriel said. The cooks sometimes ran out box lunches and water to those

Beaucastel heritage in California took shape in 1986. A long vineyard search ended with a land purchase in Paso Robles in 1990.

That same year, the first vine cuttings were imported from France. They underwent a three-year indexing mandated by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to ensure virus-free vines. To multiply the indexed vine cuttings into quantities needed to plant a vineyard, Tablas Creek constructed a nursery complex of high-tech greenhouses and shadehouses.

Planting that began in 1993 continues at the estate with the goal of having 110 acres in vines by 2005. Grape varieties include several clones each of mourvedre, grenache noir, syrah, counoise, roussanne, viognier, marsanne and grenache blanc. Such diversity allows Tablas Creek to imitate the clonal selections of a top vineyard in France's southern Rhone Valley.

Tablas Creek follows the centuries old Chateauneuf-du-Pape tradition of blending Rhone varietals, which produce more complex, better balanced and richer wines than a single vari-

WINEMAKING PHILOSOPHY

Beginning with small experimental lots, Tablas Creek has now hit stride.

The winemaking philosophy of Neil Collins, who works closely with Pierre Perrin, winemaker and director of technical operations at Chateau de Beaucastel, is focused on linking wines to both their heritage and where they are grown.

Only grapes grown on the estate are used for the Tablas Creek wines and only organic farming methods are used. Weed controls is done largely by hand hoeing and the vineyard is dry-farmed as much as possible. Only native yeasts are used to ferment the hand-harvested grapes. Such organic methods, as you know if you buy organic products, increases the price. It is no different for wine.

Passover, which begins Wednesday, is celebrated for eight days to commemorate the liberation of the Jewish people from Egyptian slavery.

This year, Andy Roisman expects to celebrate Passover with friends, only this year some of her friends will also be celebrating the liberation of another people - Iraqi Chaldeans, or Christians who were persecuted by Saddam Hussein for their religious or political beliefs.

CHRAIN MIT TZIKEL

(Eastern European Horseradish With Beets)

The sinus-clearing pungency of chrain (Yiddish for "horseradish," from the Slavic khrin) has earned its place in Jewish cuisine as a topping for gefilte fish and sometimes as the bitter herb at the Passover Seder. But horseradish proves much more versatile, as it goes well with cold meats, vegetables, and fish. Add a generous amount for a tangy flavor or just a bit for a subtle taste to salads, soups, or casseroles.

1 (4-inch-long) horseradish root, peeled and finely grated

2 medium beets, cooked, peeled, and finely grated 2 to 4 tablespoons distilled white or cider vinegar

about 2 teaspoons kosher salt 1 teaspoon sugar

Combine all of the ingredients, seasoning to taste. Let stand at room temperature for 2 hours. Cover and store in the refrigerator for up to 3 weeks.

Coriander, fennel spice up chickpea stew

No one is saying you must become vegetarian, but the health benefits of a mostly plantbased diet have become increasingly clear. If you are devoted to eating meat, adding more meatless meals, beyond pasta and pizza, can be challenging. But using a wide variety of herbs, spices and other seasonings will boost flavors, making this idea more enjoyable.

Think of countries where little or no meat is used most of the time. In the Mediterranean, fresh and dried herbs are a natural part of everyday cooking, enlivening dishes from French onion soup seasoned with thyme to Moroccan vegetable tagines spiced with cumin and cinna-

In Latin America, cumin, cilantro and epazote, a wild oregano, are as much mainstays as chile peppers. Indians, of course, use a wide array of spices and herbal seasonings, like curry leaf to enrich meatless curries or to dal, a legume dish eaten every day.

Southeast Asian cooking is perfumed with cilantro, lemongrass and galangal, a knobby, more aromatic relative of gin-

Through eating in ethnic restaurants and travelling broadly, Americans have become more aware of how much seasonings can enrich a meal, and we keep a wellstocked spice rack.

MEDITERRANEAN CHICKPEA STEW WITH TOASTED NOODLES

I tablespoon extra virgin olive oil 1/2 Spanish onion, chopped 1 celery rib, diced 2 garlic cloves, finely minced

2 tablespoons chili powder I tablespoon unsweetened cocoa

powder 2 teaspoons ground coriander 1 teaspoon ground fennel I large bay leaf

1 can (28 oz.) whole tomatoes ¼ lb. fideos or angel hair egg pasta

1 can (15 oz.) chickpeas, rinsed and drained 6 cups chopped fresh Swiss

chard leaves (about 11/2 bunches), or 1 package (10 oz.) frozen chopped spinach, defrosted and squeezed dry

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Over medium-high heat, heat the oil in a large pot that can be used stove-top and in the oven. Sauté the onion and celery until onion is translucent, about 3 minutes. Stir in garlic. Cook 1 minute. Stir in chili powder, cocoa, coriander, fennel and bay leaf. Add tomatoes with their liquid.

Add 4 cups water. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer until celery is tender, about 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, on a non-stick baking sheet, break up pasta into 6 2-inch pieces. Spread evenly in pan. Bake 4 to 5 minutes, just until golden brown, watching carefully to avoid burning. Mix toasted noodles, chickpeas and greens into the stew. Cook until the pasta is tender, about 10 minutes. Ladle into shallow, wide bowls, and serve. Makes 8 servings.



Greek Roast Lamb with Lemon-Egg Crust: Blend together 12 lightly beaten eggs, 1/2 to 1/4 cup lemon juice, and salt and pepper to taste. Pour over the roasted lamb and place the lamb under the broiler. Broil until lightly browned but not rubbery, about 10 minutes.

Meshwi/Mischui (Moroccan Roast Lamb): With a mortar and pestle, crush together/2 cup chopped fresh parsley, 2 teaspoons ground cumin or 1 tablespoon cumin seeds, 2 to 3 teaspoons salt, 2 large cloves garlic, 1/2 teaspoon seeded and minced red chili or a dash of cayenne pepper, and if desired,1/2 teaspoon crumbled saffron

Rub over the lamb, drizzle with I cup (2 sticks) melted margarine, and roast as above, basting frequently. (Note: Meshwi is usually prepared from a whole lamb in a brick or mud oven, but this is impractical for most home kitchens.)

Serves 6-8.

(ASHKENAZIC FLOURLESS NUT CAKE)

Since tortes rely on beaten eggs for leavening and contain little or no flour, they are perfect for Passover as well as any time during the year. This nut sponge cake is a typical Ashkenazic Passover dessert, customarily served plain or with weinschaum, a wine sauce similar to the Italian zabaglione. Modern cooks find it very versatile, adding chopped dates or candied citron; substituting I cup of mashed bananas or applesauce or 11/2 cups of grated apples or carrots for the wine; or adding 3 tablespoons of cocoa powder.

1 cup finely chopped walnuts. pecans, or hazelnuts

½ cup sweet red wine or orange iuice

1 cup matzah cake meal (or ½ cup matzah cake meal and 1/2 cup potato starch)

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger or

cloves ¼ teaspoon salt

8 large eggs, whites and yolks separated

2 cups sugar 1/4 cup warm water

2 tablespoons lemon juice

Preheat oven to 350º. Grease and line with waxed paper two 8-inch-square baking pans, one 10-inch springform pan, or one 10-inch tube pan.

Soak the nuts in the wine or . orange juice while you prepare the batter. Sift together the cake meal, cinnamon, ginger or cloves, and salt. Beat the egg yolks, sugar, and warm water until pale and creamy, 10 to 15 minutes. Stir in the nut mixture and lemon juice. Fold in the cake meal mixture.

Using clean beaters, beat the egg whites until stiff but not dry. Fold one-quarter of the egg whites into the yolk mixture to lighten, then gently fold in the remaining whites.

Pour into the prepared pans.

Bake until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 35 minutes for single layers. 45 minutes for the springform pan, and 50 minutes for the tube pan.

Let cool completely. Wrap the cake and store at room temperature or in the freezer.

Variation: Increase the amount of nuts to 2 cups and omit the matzah cake meal.

Recipes celebrate Passover Eight days of Passover begin Wednesday

WHEN IT IS

The Jewish holiday of Passover or Pesach (PAY-SACH) in Hebrew, is observed for 8 days each year beginning with the 15th day of the month of Nisan on the Hebrew calendar. The holiday continues until sundown of the eighth day.

During the first two days and the last two days (Reform movement members, the first and last days only) many children do not attend school and many adults refrain from work. Activities continue as usual during the middle four days. (See heading How It is Celebrated for information on special handling food and kitchen utensils.)

ITS SIGNIFICANCE

Passover commemorates the liberation of the Jewish people from Egyptian slavery, approximately 1280 B.C.E. (Before the Common Era* which is equivalent of B.C. in common usage), and the resultant Exodus of the Children of Israel from Egypt.

THE HISTORY OF PASSOVER

Moses, as leader of the Jewish people in Egypt, asked Pharaoh to "let my people go." When Pharaoh refused, a series of 10 plagues, each one worse than the one before, were brought against the people of Egypt. But after each

plague, Pharaoh refused. The 10th plague was the death of all first-born males in Egypt. The angel of death slew every first-born Egyptian male, but "passed over" the homes of the Jews.

In their haste to leave Egypt, the Isralites did not have time enough to let their dough for bread-baking rise. To this day, unleavened bread is eaten during the eight days of Passover.

Passover is observed universally each year as a reminder to Jews that the Children of Israel were delivered from slavery in Egypt. It is also a reminder to each Jew that, because his forefathers were freed, he or she was delivered from slavery. With this knowledge of the evils of oppression, one must act righteously and strive for justice for all.

HOW IT IS CELEBRATED

The first two nights of Passover are celebrated in Jewish homes with a feast called the seder (SAY DER). The word seder literally means "order" of the service.

It is a ceremonial dinner marked by the retelling of the story of the Exodus from Egypt through the use of prayers, songs, and ceremonial foods.

A special book, the Haggadah (HAH-GAH-DAH), is used during the seder. The word Haggadah means "the telling" of the story or narrative. A book that has emerged

over the centuries fixing the rituals of the seder, it is frequently illustrated, often very beautifully.

The head of the household serves as the leader of the seder, directing the reading of the Haggadah. Everyone present participates, including the youngest person, who recites a Passover tradition, "The Four Questions." The Haggadah tells the story of passover through answers to The Four Questions.

During the seder, participants sit with a pillow behind them. This signifies the freedom obtained from the Exodus, in that all free people sit in a relaxed manner.

FOODS OF THE SEDER

Matzah (MA-TZA), unleavened bread, is eaten throughout the seder.

Three matzahs are placed on the seder table and covered or placed in a cloth container.

The seder plate is a large plate, usually a beautifully decorated work of art, which has a place for each of the ritual seder foods.

As a reminder of the lamb which was ritually slaughtered and then eaten by Jewish families on the eve of Passover in biblical times, a roasted lamb bone is placed on the seder

Horseradish, or Maror (MA-ROAR), is the bitter herbs which reminds us of the bitterness of slavery. Charosis

(CHA-ROW-SUS), a sweet mixture of chopped apples, nuts, cinnamon, and wine, symbolized the mortar made to hold together the bricks the Jews produced while slaves in Egypt. Karpas (CAR-PAHS), is a green vegetable usually parsley or celery, used to symbolize spring and renewal. It is dipped in salt water, which symbolizes the tears of the Jews in Egypt. A roasted egg is also placed on the seder plate as a symbol of the burnt offerings made by the Israelites in ancient times.

A special cup of wine is placed on the seder table for the prophet Elijah. According to Jewish tradition, Elijah will foretell the coming of the Messiah.

During the service, there is time when the door of the house is opened and Elijah is "invited to enter."

No leavened bread is eaten during Passover's eight days. In addition, certain other foods containing yeast or other leavening agents are forbidden by Jewish law to be eaten at the time. All such forbidden foods, called chometz (CHUM-MUTZ), are removed from the home no later than the morning of the day before Passover begins. Separate dishes, silverware and cooking utensils are customarily used during the eight-day celebration.

A roasted lamb bone is placed on a seder plate as a reminder of the lamb ritually slaughtered and eaten by Jewish families on the eve of

Passover in biblical times.

Horseradish or Maror (Ma-Roar) is the bitter herbs as a reminder of the bitterness of slavery. Charosis (Cha-Row-Sus) is a sweet mixture of chopped apples, nuts, cinnamon and wine, symbolized the mortar to hold together bricks Jews produced while slaves in Egypt.

A roasted egg is placed on the seder plate as a symbol of the burnt offerings made by the Israelites in ancient times.

A special cup of wine is placed on the seder table for the prophet Elijah, a

messenger who will foretell the coming of the Messiah.

During the service there is a time when the door of the house is opened and Elijah is "invited to enter."

"The Guardian' by Nicholas Sparks is a romance, and a thriller, with a Great Dane named Singer.

"I wanted the love story to be central, it's hard in a thriller" said Sparks who will be in Ann Arbor Tuesday promoting his newest book. "I've read 1,000 thrillers, but this was like inventing the wheel as far as structuring it right."

"The Guardian," he says, is a modern day Greek tragedy. "There's always a tragedy in my novels," said Singer. "Readers laugh, get angry, frustrated, enjoy and feel the process of falling in love, and they want to cry."

Julie Barenson was a throwaway whose life changed when she met Jim at a diner in Daytona. He helped her get a full-time job at his Aunt Mabel's beauty salon in Swansboro, North Carolina, but didn't seem interested in dating. After lots of shameless hints, he finally got the message and married her. Jim died of a brain tumor a few weeks after their fourth anniversary leaving Julie, then 25, a widow.

On Christmas Eve, 40 days after his death, she gets a surprise delivery – a Great Dane puppy – with a note from Jim promising to be her guardian angel.

Fast forward four years, Julie, now 29, begins dating again. But who should she pick?

Richard Franklin is a consultant on a bridge project in town. He's college-educated, handsome, sophisticated, and takes her to the "Phantom of the Opera" and on a hot-air balloon ride in one weekend. But while she can't put her finger on it, something about Richard makes her uneasy.

Mike Harris was Jim's best friend, and comforted Julie when he died. An all-around nice guy, he's more comfortable


Swansboro's a small town where everyone knows everyone else's business. But will they be able to protect Julie when her life turns into a nightmare? You'll have to read the book to find out.

"The Guardian" is Sparks' seventh novel, actually ninth if you count the two that didn't get published.

"I wrote my first novel when I was 19 to see if I could do it," Sparks said. "I never edited it or read it a second time. Then I planned to go to law school, but I didn't get in, so I went on with my life."

He majored in business finance at Notre Dame and graduated with high honors in 1988. A year later he married Catherine, the woman he met on spring break in 1988, and started a family. Sparks worked a variety of jobs, and took up writing again. He wrote a second novel that was also rejected.

His first successful novel, "The Notebook," published in 1996, took six months to write. He spent




another six months editing it before sending out the first draft.

"Message in a Bottle" followed in 1998, "A Walk To Remember," 1999, "The Rescue," 2000, "A Bend in the Road," 2001, and "Nights in Rodanthe." The movie version of "Message in a Bottle" was released in 1999 and "A Walk To Remember" in January 2002. The film version for "The Notebook" will be released this year, and film rights to "A Bend in the Road" and "Nights in Rodanthe" have been sold. "The Rescue" is being adapted into a TV series.

North Carolina has been his home since 1992, and is the setting for his novels. "I live there and try to keep certain elements the same," he said. As a writer of dramatic fiction, he's drawn to small towns where everyone knows everyone's business and there are no secrets. Places where family. church, and belief in community are important. Of course, you can't overlook beaches, wild horses, and sunsets which are romantic and also found in North Carolina.

His next book, "The Wedding," is about love and renewal. Look for it this fall.

A little cropping can enhance photos

Tears ago, I remember seeing a mattress tag that spelled out in no uncertain terms "do not open under penalty of law." How ridiculous, I thought, yet I bet there are people who wouldn't think of snipping off that sacred tag.

In numerous photography judgings and critiques over the years, I've noticed a similar reverence. That is, people hesitate altering the size of their finished prints and slides. They feel either they can't cut down that 8 by 10 enlargement or they're not aware of the improvements that can be made by slight cropping.

Yes, cropping your photograph when needed can dramatically improve the impact and

strength of your final image. I've seen many a gorgeous,

well-composed and well executed print that suffers, for example, only from that distracting bright patch of sky in the upper corner. Cropping just a half inch or so off the top of the shot eliminating the "hot spot" will impressively improve your shot.

How about that special sunset picture of yours that has just too much sky and too

much foreground. Cropping some off top and bottom will produce a much more striking 'panorama" sunset.

Or your favorite zoo shot of the giraffe stretching his neck upward to reach the berries on the branch. Wouldn't a vertical crop enhance this picture? You bet!

A cropped print may preclude you from using pre-cut mats available in many stores. But for just a couple dollars more, any frame shop can custom tailor mats to your cropped print.


Slides can be cropped, too. In fact, a slide presentation can be made much more interesting by cropping some of the images providing a variety of size slides. Your local photo dealer stocks Gepe brand slide mounts, easy

to assemble and available in many pre-cropped shapes.

In discussing cropping, I am not suggesting photographing the whole scene and then deciding later what parts to crop out. I believe in cropping through the camera to obtain the best possible negative or slide. Then use cropping if necessary to enhance your photograph.

Cropping can dramatically improve your pictures. Just think, if you begin to crop your photographs, you might just trim off that mattress tag!







Pack your wooden shoes, it's tulip time in Holland

If you and yours need an excuse to get out of town, consider Holland, a fun destination on Michigan's sunset coast. Here's a sampling of what's happening:

TULIP TIME

"During Tulip Time, visitors have an opportunity to experience the Dutch heritage that this community has been able to hang on to for the past 150 years," said Sally Laukitis, executive director, Holland Area Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Tulips highlight the fest that runs May 3-10. There are more than six million planted throughout the community.


Equally impressive, dressed in authentic Dutch garb and wearing wooden shoes, are the Klompen dancers. Watch them perform throughout the town. Entertainment runs the gamut from singers and dancers, to jazz, show tunes and barbershop concerts.

There are three parades. On May 7 the Volksparade begins with the "Dutch Cleanliness" tradition when hundreds of Dutchcostumed townspeople, armed with brooms and pails, precede the parade and scrub the route clean. The Kinderparade takes place on May 8. And, the grand finale, with floats, bands and Klompen Dancers, happens on May 10 with the Muziekparade.

WINDMILL ISLAND

Pack a picnic lunch. Then, head just a stone's throw from the downtown district to Windmill Island, home to this country's only authentic operating Dutch windmill. The island, decked with 90,000 radiant spring tulips, furnishes an ideal backdrop for picnics and family relaxation.

For starters, join a guided tour of the windmill. "It is so incredible to watch the grinding process." said Laukitis, referring to the working gears that change Michigan wheat into whole wheat flour. Save time to ride the 1895 carousel. Or, browse through the shops

that feature candle carvers, fudge and Dutch souvenirs.

The Holland State Park provides a favorite hideaway for the Cytacki family of Livonia.

"When we camp in Holland, it feels like we're visiting twodifferent parks," said Maggie Cytacki, who has camped a handful of times at the park with family members.

Holland State Park, the most popular state park in the mitten-shaped state, not only offers typical wooded camping areas, it provides spectacular lakeshore beaches.

Sporting frontage on Lakes Michigan and Macatawa, travelers are treated to stunning views of Big Red, Holland's harbor lighthouse.

Rent a bicycle, inline skates or a personal watercraft. Kite

flying, paddling, swimming and fishing are other popular activities for campers.

If you head north of the campgrounds you'll discover another shoreline treasure, Tunnel Park. Named for the unique tunnel built through the dune, this 22-acre park supplies fun-in-the-sun adventures. And, according to Cytacki, if offers "one of the prettiest views of Lake Michigan.

DUTCH VILLAGE

Enjoy a time-travel journey at Dutch Village, a theme park and wooden shoe

factory. "We are a recreation of a late 1800s village in the Netherlands," said Julie Nelis Steggerda, marketing director of the 30-structure park.

Stop by the Weighhouse & Hekenwaag, an authentic 17th century weigh house where

A great way to learn fascinating tidbits about the city's history requires a trek to one

of the local museums. The Holland Museum covers

events from "settlement to city." This museum is a hidden treasure, especially if you have Dutch roots," said Mary Lynne Mount, docent. The Archives and Research Library provides

a great tool for genealogy buffs. If you visit before June 1, check out Promised Land, Chosen People: The Bible and Dutch Identity, 1500-1900. This exhibit traces the evolution of the bible from the 16th century to its manifestations in the 19th century Dutch settlements of Michigan.

The Cappon House Museum features one of the country's largest collections of early Grand Rapids furniture in its original setting. And, if you drop by the Settlers House, you'll get a taste for the many hardships that early settlers faced.

DEKLOMP, DELFTWARE

Ever wonder how wooden

Also on the premises is the

only Delftware factory in the United States. A Pour Room, Kiln Room and Paint Room offer visitors a peek at how the traditional process of hand-painted blue and white porcelain is completed. The gift shop features a diverse selection of Delftware. There is no admission charge to watch the factory workers or artists.



Optomap

New eye care technology makes it easier to detect and prevent eye disease

A revolutionary development in the field of eye care technology is improving ophthalmologists' and optometrists' ability to detect and prevent eye disease. The noninvasive procedure is now being offered at Suburban Eye Care in Livonia - only the second practice in the state of Michigan to offer the modality.

Optomap, a retinal eye exam, takes a full color digital image of the retina in less than one second. The image improves a doctor's ability to see virtually the entire retina. Conventional tests only expose a small area of the retina at a time (approximately 30 percent). The Optomap technology reveals 200 percent of the back of your eye to help doctors check retina health and determine if it is showing signs of damage or disease.

The technology is so precise it's helping doctors detect eye disease at its earliest stages in hopes of treating the issue successfully and avoiding vision

"The Optomap increases the quality of the retinal exam by allowing us to view almost the entire retina at the start of the exam, which can have important implications, not only for detecting eye disease, but also in detecting and managing other medical

conditions such as diabetes," said Dr. John P. Jacobi. "We recommend all of our patients have this exam, which has etected issues in some o patients that could have otherwise gone undetected."


COMFORTABLE AND QUICK

The Optomap retinal exam takes a computer-generated high resolution image of the retina, which can be instantaneously evaluated by doctors. Aside from the technological advancement the system possesses, it provides a comfortable and quick way for patients to be tested without the need for pupil dilation, eye drops, blurred vision or sensitivity

Larry Marihugh, a Livonia resident, suffers from retinitis pigmentosa (RP) the name given to a group of disorders of the retina, all of which result in a progressive reduction in vision. The retina is the light-sensitive tissue inside the eye in which the first stages of seeing take place. In RP disorders, various parts of the retina cease to

function. Marihugh's 78-year-old father and aunt both have the condition but at the present time neither of his sons have

been diagnosed. "This machine took a picture of my eye, and Dr. Jacobi showed me how the walls of the blood vessels around my

retina are starting to thin. That's because of the RP. There's nothing they can do right now except monitor it," added Marihugh.

The 53-year-old Livonia man says he was diagnosed at 45 and is appreciative of the technology that will eliminate his need to have his eyes dilated all the time in order for the doctor to check the progress of RP. "I think it's great."

DRIVEN

The Optos modality was developed by Douglas Anderson, a 50-year-old industrial designer whose 5-year-old son, Leif, suffered spontaneous retinal detachment in 1990. The condition was detected too late and the child subsequently lost the sight in one eye.

Concerned by the limited capabilities of the tools that practitioners had available to them to view the retina effectively and to help prevent what had happened to Leif happening to others, Douglas then put his company, Crombie Anderson Design Consultants, to work to find a way to examine the retina in a more doctorand patient-friendly way.

Anderson and his team of engineers spent three years researching possible solutions to the problem, and the next three years were dedicated to developing a useful product. This work led to the development of the Panoramic200, the world's first ophthalmic device capable of producing a single, highresolution ultra widefield image of the retina (known as the Optomap Retinal Image) without the need for dilation of the pupil.

"This exam lets us document the peripheral region of the eye and not just the center," said Jacobi. "It has

Dry eye syndrome could lead to loss of vision

ore than 10 million Americans are affected by dry eye syndrome. Of those, several million don't even realize it. Many people experience periodic or constant irritation, stinging or burning and think it's normal. They may attribute it to getting

older or their dusty workplace. While those things can certainly contribute to dry eye, they're not good enough reasons to tolerate the symptoms. Dry eye syndrome is a preventable condition that can lead to severe eye damage and loss of vision if left untreated.

What is dry eye syndrome?

Dry eye syndrome is the decline of the quality or quantity of tears bathing the eye. It may be due to the eyes not producing enough tears, not being able to maintain the proper amount of tears or producing tears with the wrong chemical makeup. How are tears produced?

The body makes two types of tears. Lubricating tears are made while awake. They keep your eyes moist and clean and help fight infection. The tear film contains layers of water, mucus and oil. Dry eye occurs when any of these layers is disrupted. Reflex tears are made in response to injury, irritation (such as smoke or dust) or emotion.

What are the symptoms of dry eye syndrome?

Dry eye symptoms can vary greatly, but most commonly include: irritated, scratchy red eyes; itching; a stringy mucus discharge: a sandy, gritty feeling and/or a foreign body sensation. Some of the early warning signs are an occasional burning sensation in the eyes when in areas of low humidity or high pollution, the inability to cry under emotional stress, decreased tolerance of contact lenses, watering eyes or blurred vision. Because prolonged dry eye may result in permanent damage, it is imperative that

My eyes are watering all the time. How can that be dry eye syndrome?

If dry eye is related to the quality of tears, rather than the quantity, excessive tearing may occur in response to that poor quality. Therefore, when an essential component of the tears is missing, the eye receives little comfort naturally, resulting in irritation that continues to stimulate tear production.

What causes dry eye syndrome?

The most common culprit is aging, which results in decreased tears, but many other things may be to blame. General health problems, like arthritis, Sjorgen's Syndrome, lupus, leukemia or thyroid disorders, can lead to dry eye. Incomplete or decreased blinking from a mechanical or anatomical problem or because of prolonged near work can be the problem. People taking certain medications, such as antibiotics, oral contraceptives, hormone replacement therapy, antihistamines and diuretics, may suffer

these early warning signs are not ignored. also. Many individuals are affected by infection or inflammation of the tear-producing glands. This condition is known as blepharitis, or meibomianitis, and may need to be treated with antibiotics.

Who is affected?

Many of the 10 million people suffer from age-related dry eye; in fact, it is estimated that 75 percent of people 65 and older will experience dry eye symptoms. It occurs in both men and women, but is most common in women who are pregnant or post-menopausal. People suffering from allergies and those wearing contact lenses have a greater risk of developing dry eye.

How is dry eye syndrome treated?

Unfortunately, dry eye cannot be cured, but treatments do exist that may virtually eliminate the symptoms. Therapy can be very simple, but there are instances when more complex treatment

made our patients more involved and aware of their vision and will help them make better decisions about their health."

The technology combines the latest in scanning laser ophthalmoscope (SLO) technology, using low-powered red-green laser beams to capture an image of virtually the entire retina on an "Optomap," a permanent digital record that gives clinicians a view of the retina that is unprecedented with prior technologies.

Jacobi said if practitioners took photographs of the eye for documentation they were of "Polaroid" quality. Images are taken in .25 seconds and are stored on CD in both color and black and white. Vision issues are the cause and effect for other health-related conditions (diabetic retinopathy, retinal detachments, macular degeneration), and an optometrist or ophthalmologist can e-mail the images directly to your primary care physician or a specialist (endocrinologist).

'The images are cut and dry. They go a long way in giving people peace of mind about the condition of their eyes and are making people with health issues like hypertension and diabetes more serious about taking medications and about being proactive with their exams," said Jacobi.

"There's no doubt this advancement in retinal

imagery is knocking down a barrier we had with people who don't like to have their eyes dilated and for us the accuracy with which we can view the eye is amazing. It has the potential to become part of the standard care and testing we offer here and in other offices."

Once the split-second images are captured by Jacobi, his partner, Dr. Michael Peterson, or a Suburban Eye Care staff member, they are archived and stored on CD-ROM. The cost of the test is \$31 (for both eyes) and is currently not covered by insurance except Medicare.

"We are able to keep the fee nominal and are hoping more and more people see the benefits of this revolution in eye care technology," added Jacobi.

is necessary. Some available

treatments include: Artificial tears and lubricating ointments provide temporary relief and can be used whenever the eye feels dry.

Tiny plugs placed in the ducts that drain tears can benefit some forms of dry eye. By blocking the drainage of the

tears, the eye stays in contact with its own tears for a longer period of time resulting in greater comfort.


■ Nutritional supplements in the form of soft gel caplets work by preventing drying and atrophy of the tear glands as well as providing essential nutrients that regulate all three layers of the tear film.

Prescription drops that improve the health and function of one of the glands essential for tear production.

There are also simple lifestyle changes that can significantly improve the symptoms of dry eyes. For example, drink eight glasses of water daily to keep the body hydrated and flush impurities. Make a conscious effort to blink frequently, especially when reading or working on the computer. Avoid rubbing the eyes, as it only worsens the irritation. Dry eye can be a continual



The workplace can be dangerous to your eyes

Whether you work in an office or on a construction site. remember to take care of your eyes while at work.

Think existing safety legislation and educational programs protect workers? Think again. Each working day in the United States, more than 2,000 employees sustain job-related eye injuries, making workplace injury a leading cause of ocular trauma, visual loss and blind-

If you're one of the millions of Americans who spend a lot of time in front of a computer monitor, you've probably experienced eye problems from time to time. While computer screens don't damage vision, eyestrain and dry eye are symptoms from which workers need relief.

To mark March's designation as Workplace Eye Safety Month, the American Academy of Ophthalmology wants to remind Americans of the importance of wearing proper eye protection in the industrial workplace, as well as provide practical advice for dealing with computer eyestrain and dry eye.

About 90 percent of workplace eye injuries can be prevented if workers wear appropriate

"Many of the injured workers I see didn't think they needed to wear eye protection, or were

wearing eyewear inappropriate for the job," said Academy spokesperson Dr. Ruth Williams. "Safety eyewear must have 'ANSI Z87.1'marked on the frame or

Dr. Williams has the following advice for treating minor eye irritations:

■ If liquid gets into your eye, flush it gently with water for at least 15 minutes, then call the poison center or your doctor for further advice. Don't rub or touch it, and don't apply any pressure or medication.

■ If an object gets trapped in your eye, cover the affected eye with a paper cup or eye shield until you can get to a doctor.

For relieving eyestrain, Williams says rearranging your computer workstation, taking more frequent rest breaks, or getting proper glasses may do the trick. To pinpoint the cause of your discomfort, first get an eye exam. Your Eye M.D. can rule out the possibility of eye disease as the cause of your symp-

You may find you need glasses when working at a computer, or that your prescription needs updating.

Next, take a look at your workstation:

Screen distance: Sit about 20 inches from the computer monitor, a little farther away

than reading distance, with the top of the screen at or below eye level.

Equipment: Choose a monitor that tilts or swivels, and has both contrast and brightness controls.

Furniture: Use an adjustable chair.

■ Working documents: Place materials on a document holder, so you don't have to keep looking back and forth, refocusing your eyes and turning your neck and head.

■ Lighting: Modify lighting to eliminate reflections or glare. A hood or micromesh filter for your screen might help limit reflections and glare.

Rest breaks: Take periodic rest breaks, and try to blink often to keep your eyes from drying

In addition, forced-air heating systems of big office buildings can also increase problems with dry eyes during the winter, said Williams. Dry eye occurs when the eye doesn't produce enough tears to keep the eye comfortable. Usual symptoms include stinging or burning eyes, scratchiness, a feeling that there's something in the eye, excessive tearing or difficulty wearing contact lenses. Over-the-counter eye drops called artificial tears usually help, but if dry eye persists, see your Eye M.D. for an evaluation.

There are two types of lung cancer - small cell lung cancer and non-small cell lung cancer - a disease in which malignant cells form in the tissues of the lungs. Non-small cell accounts for 80 percent of lung cancer.

The biggest risk factor for developing lung cancer is smoking.

Henry Ford's two clinical trials target patients with non-small cell lung cancer as either a first-line or secondline treatment option. Firstline treatment is standard chemotherapy.

In one clinical trial, patients will receive chemotherapy with docetaxel or in combination with docetaxel and

genasense, a new drug. Docetaxel, the first chemical agent approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for use as a second-line therapy for treating non-small cell lung cancer, has shown to significantly improve the survival of the patients.


Genasense, administered intravenously using a pump, is designed to block production of a certain protein in cancer cells, thereby enhancing the effectiveness of chemotherapy.

In the second trial, doctors are testing the effectiveness of using a new antibody agent. ABX-EGF, in combination with two common chemotherapy drugs. ABX-EGF, which has shown promise for blocking the growth of cancer cells, is used as a first-line therapy for patients who have not yet had treatment.




Condominiums with porches and balconies at Forester Square are placed close together near side walks and the street to foster interaction among residents.





(AP) - Former Gov. William Milliken and former Attorney General Frank Kelley are teaming up again to tackle one not desirable. If we make goal that frustrated the pair when they led state government's environmental efforts.

The duo are co-chairmen of a new state commission charged with recommending new land use rules to curb unfettered growth, loss of farmland and decay of core urban areas.

Some experts say a new acceptance by businesses of land-use efforts means they might not run into the deadend they hit when they tried to discuss a land-use plan in the 1970s and the years after.

"There was a rigidity of attitudes then," Milliken said. "I think things have changed dramatically. People have seen the urban sprawl and they don't like what they're seeing."

Kelley agrees with Milliken that finding a solution to landuse problems won't be easy or quick, but that business has a new attitude on the issue.

"When it comes to any regulation of somebody's property rights, it's a hard sell," he said.

But Kelley added: "In the last 25 years, we have seen industry realize that sprawl is progress this time, it will be with the backing of business that wasn't there before."

James Barrett, Michigan Chamber of Commerce president, said improving land use was key to luring businesses and workers to Michigan.

"We're talking quality of life issues," he said. "One of the greatest challenges facing business today is the attraction and retention of employees.

"The days of radical environmentalism (have) passed. People come together today to see what can be done to assure we're going to have a quality of life that will encourage investment and encourage people to live here."

The 26-member Michigan Land Use Leadership Council has met for the first time and is scheduled to convene again on April 14.

Formed by Gov. Jennifer Granholm and legislative leaders of both parties in the House and Senate, it is scheduled to issue recommendations

State land use council meets, sets public hearings

Besides Milliken, Kelley and Barrett, the council includes key legislators, business leaders, local government officials, environmentalists and representatives of farming, real estate and home building.

Robert R. Jones, a West Bloomfield builder and former president of the Michigan Home Builders Association, is a member, as is Mick McGraw, a Grand Rapids-area builder/developer.

So, too, is Gil White, director of the Michigan Association of Realtors.

The land use leadership council has scheduled public hearings 3-5 and 6:30-8:30 p.m. Monday, April 21, at the Oakland County Board of Commissioners Auditorium, 1200 N. Telegraph Road, Pontiac; and at the same times Monday, April 28, at the college of engineering, Wayne State University, Warren at Anthony Wayne Drive, Detroit.

Granholm gave a lyrical speech at the council's first meeting.

She said people who question the need for the council

"don't know the feeling of the warm sand on the dunes between the toes. Perhaps they have never stood on the rocks above Lake Superior and looked out ... Those people who question why need only to gape at the beauty of our Michigan homeland.

"We don't want a state adorned with strip malls and wearing only gray pavement," Granholm said. "We are gobbling up the land at a rate the our population won't support ... and we can no longer tolerate."

But agreement on land use won't be easy.

Senate Majority Leader Ken Sikkema, R-Wyoming, himself a former environmental activist, was openly skeptical. So was the head of the Michigan Association of Home Builders.

"If the direction of the council is, 'We're going to tell people where they can live,' it's going to be a failure," Sikkema said.

Lynn Egbert, chief executive officer of the home builders association, said there is no groundswell of criticism

against urban sprawl.

"I don't think it's a public outcry. People have been happy with where they live," he said.

Environmental leaders support Milliken's and Kelley's desire to tackle land-use problems.

"I'm more optimistic than any time in 20 years of watching this," said David Dempsey, senior policy analyst for the Michigan Environmental Council, a coalition of environmental

groups. He said a litmus test of the council will be whether it recommends shutting off state assistance - such as highway construction money and business tax breaks - that

encourage expansion and construction outside urban areas.











There are so many people out there who absolutely can't stand the looks of the Chevrolet Avalanche. They don't even like the fact that it's a pickup truck and a sport utility vehicle that's interchangeable. In a matter of seconds, mind you.

Let those people stand in line for another glass of ginger ale, Mickey Redmond style.

I love the looks. I think it's a comfortable and versatile sport utility vehicle and a great pickup truck that can live up to the Chevrolet "like a rock" reputation. It looks especially great in all black, too.

Let's get to the heart and soul of this truck right away. The Avalanche driven was outfitted with a Vortec 5300 V8 single fuel injected engine. This 5.3-liter engine is powerful as all get out and provides 285 horses to get you through just about any situation, whether you're on city roads, dirt bypasses or any mud and muck you can throw at it. This is the standard engine, by the way.

Also available is a Hulk Hogan-type 8.1-liter engine capable of 340 horsepower and can tow up to 12,000 pounds. This package is also outfitted with a three-section frame with front and rear rails that gives it even more strength and stiffness.


Did I mention that Avalanche seats six people in complete comfort? Try doing that with most SUVs on the

And the pickup bed is more than adequate even in the SUV mode. But convert this truck and you've got a whopping 8-foot-1-inch box that accommodates sheets of plywood.

This new Convert-A-Cab system is really quite

It can be used as a 6-passenger sport utility vehicle and then easily converted to a truck, or with the rear window removed, an open-air vehicle. Quite versatile.

Assessing the rear was quite simple. Pull down the rear seat back and that exposes the steps you need to take. A lever here, a pull there, a snap here and a tug

there. Done. There's the truck. Pull up the rear of the rear window and place in the midgate and it's gone. Simple, easy as pie and all, thankfully, self-explanatory. I liked that a lot. Simplicity is the key to an easier life.

This year, Chevrolet added a host of new safety, comfort, convenience and performance features. Stuff like every seating position having its own restraint system. side air bags, front passenger sensing air bag system.

Now, this feature is cool, and while Chevrolet isn't the first to have it, it's still a really neat feature. This system figures out whether the person sitting next to you is an adult or a kid, just by the weight and tension of the seat belt. If it senses it has a child in front, the air bag turns itself off. If there's an adult in that seat, the air bag is automatically enabled. And all the while you know the status, because in the bottom of the rear view mirror, it will tell you.

The Avalanche I drove has the Autotrac four-wheeldrive system, and although we had a 6-inch snowstorm, I never had a reason to turn it on. The two-wheel drive mode handled all that snow without a complaint or a slip or a spinning tire. Now that's cool.

Available on the Avalanche are all the neat entertainment systems now coming with just about every car and truck on the road today. Stuff like the DVE player with flip-down screen, radio data system and XM Satellite Radio. Rear seat passengers can control their own audio controls or have separate audio choices from the front seat passengers (read that as mom and dad, who like that funky country stuff - hey, it's a truck, what do you

want?)

Inside, the entire truck is extremely comfortable and the instrumentation on the driver's side is truly refreshingly simple. There's a driver's information center that monitors nearly 35 vehicle systems and can tell you whether the door is ajar or whether conditions are favorable for "ice" - and you can read that as "it's c-c-cold out there".

There's also a new exterior color to choose from this year - yellow. C'mon, Chevy paint folks, next you'll offer chartreuse, right? Yellow. Yuck.

Finally, the Avalanche is also offered in a North Face Edition for those outdoorsy types. It features the North Face logo, white instrument cluster backpacks, storage bags and exterior colors like sage green, sunset orange, onyx, black, pewter and white.

Oh, I did have one complaint about the Avalanche. It was the price: About \$40K. Ouch.

I had a great week in the Avalanche and it served me well in the many conditions I threw at it. Now you go take a look.
