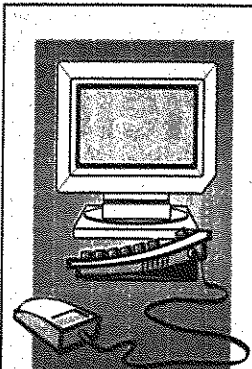

## Tails and Trails draws dog walkers

Madi and Alyssa Lewis didn't waste any time. Once they decided their Welsh corgis, Lou and Sam, were to walk the walk in Tails and Trails, they immediately pounded the pavement.

"We went door-to-door," said Madi, 8. Added Alyssa, soon to be 9, "Only three said no."

Their hard work and instinctive sales skills and charm netted \$122.50. Madi and Alyssa joined many others who collectively walked 110 dogs of all sizes, shapes and colors in the Tails and Trails Dog Walk, hosted by the Plymouth-Canton Kiwanis Breakfast Club.

Tails and Trails is one of the newest additions to Canton's 12th Annual Liberty Fest, which began Thursday afternoon.

The walk, which included a spin around the large pond in Heritage Park and a contest with prizes was a fundraiser for the canine Michigan Technical Rescue Team and the Kiwanis club.

Altogether, the effort raised more than \$8,000, with approximately \$2,500 going to the rescue team and \$3,600 to the Kiwanis.

"This is fantastic. This is way over our expectations," said Carol Heminger, who with Ginnie Hauck, organized the Liberty Fest's first-ever event devoted to dogs and their owners.

"Next year we are going to double it,"

## Speed bill goes to Senate

A bill to give townships a voice in setting speed limits on local roads moved just one step away from the governor's desk last week.

The bill, introduced early in the legislative session by State Rep. Phil LaJoy (R-Canton), received unanimous approval from the Senate Transportation Committee on Thursday and now goes to the full Senate.

LaJoy said he expects it to clear the Senate in the next few days and that the governor will sign it. The measure has already been approved unanimously by the House.

"This will be my first public act," he said. "I'm excited about it."

A similar measure cleared both houses last year but was vetoed by then-Gov. John Engler.

Under present law cities have the right to establish speed limits on local roads but township roads are controlled by county road commissions and departments and the Michigan State Police.

LaJoy's bill would give townships an equal say, along with a county road commission and the Michigan State Police, in setting the limits. All three agencies would have to agree on the speed.

## Suspect, estranged wife arraigned in bank robberies

A 40-year-old Ypsilanti man who allegedly robbed as many as five banks – and his estranged wife who allegedly helped him spend the stolen money – were both arraigned Friday on bank robbery charges.

John Joseph Sawaya, 40 and Dawn Renee Sawaya, 38, both of Ypsilanti, were arraigned in 35th District Court in connection with the June 11 robbery of a Standard Federal branch on Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth Township.

John Sawaya also was charged Thursday in connection with the robbery of the TCF Bank in Canton reported June 17. His wife has not been charged in connection with that crime.

Sawaya's arraignment was delayed Thursday because of heroin withdrawal

symptoms, which have been stabilized through medication, according to Sgt. Bob Antal, of the Plymouth Township Police Department.

His wife told police she has been heroin-free for a year, but has battled heroin addiction in the past, Antal said.

Both were charged with bank robbery and unarmed robbery, but he was also slapped with a habitual offender charge because of prior charges involving larceny, retail fraud, home invasion and more.

Bank robbery carries a maximum life sentence, unarmed robbery carries a maximum 15-year sentence and habitual offender charges carry sentences of 1.5 times the maximum allowable sentence of the crimes to which they are connected.

## Judges seek public input on family court plan

Wayne County Circuit Court Co-Chief Judge Mary Beth Kelly and Wayne County Probate Court Chief Judge Milton Mack, Jr., have announced a public comment period as the first step in developing the Family Court Plan for Wayne County.

A state law amended in 2002 requires the chief circuit and chief probate judges in each judicial circuit to enter

into an agreement by July 1 that establishes a plan known as the "Family Court Plan."

The new law requires the family court plan describe how the family division of the circuit court will operate in that circuit and how to consolidate and promote more efficient and effective services to families. The new law also requires that the chief circuit and chief probate judges seek

the input of all the judges of the circuit and probate courts, the staff of those courts and other entities that provide services to families within the circuit or that will be affected by the operation of the family division.

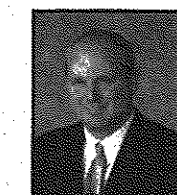

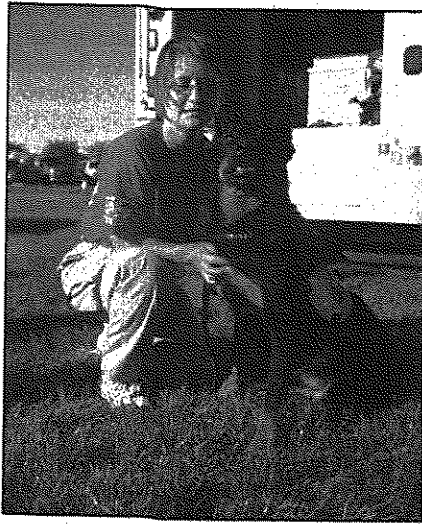
Heminger added.

As soon as Tails and Trails ended about 7 p.m. Thursday, plans were already in the works for next year's event. Brian Cowan, also known as "Bubba" the morning disc jockey for W4 Country - 102.9 radio in Ann Arbor, is already committed for next year as master of ceremonies and announcer.

"I thought it was a good opportunity to get involved in the community," said the Belleville resident, who as of yet does not own a dog. "I'm a dog lover. I think I am the bulldog - a French bulldog - kind of guy."

**SEARCH AND RESCUE**

Tails and Trails was scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. but owners and their pups began lining up as early as 3:30 p.m. As the hour drew nearer, handlers/trainers and search and rescue dogs performed demonstrations of their work with the help of kids who had come to walk their own pups. The team is trained in all types of rescue and search including lost people, structural collapse, flooding, airplanes crashes, cave-ins, confined

space rescue, water and ice recovery, mass-transportation disasters and rope rescue.

"The Kiwanis club has been great," said Mike Brink of the Michigan Technical Rescue Team, headquartered in Madison Heights, who plans to make a return visit at next year's Tails and Trails.

Lynette Brink had Raven, a search and rescue dog at Tails and Trails for demonstrations. Married to Mike for about 17 years, she decided if she

wanted to see her husband, she better get interested in search and rescue. She's never had a regret.

Her dog, Raven, a beauceron, was the result of a lot of research. "I did lots of training before so I had a better idea of what I was getting into," Brink said, about her dog, a French working breed. "They are not common dogs in America. They were just recognized by the AKC (American Kennel Club)."

She researched breeders and found one in Michigan. When she called, the breeder's dog had just had a litter of puppies. "We wanted something with a good temperament. My four-year-old daughter rides her back in the house."

While a St. Bernard may be traversing the Alps, search and rescue dogs used here in Michigan are smaller breeds. They have to be. "They need to be agile," Mike Brink said.

**CANINE CHARITY**

Char Tavarozzi of Plymouth with her pups Rocky, an 11-year-old miniature pinscher, and Gina, a three-year-old American rat terrier, was honored as the owner who raised the most money for the event with a total \$565. She received a basket from What a Card Creations.

"I just asked my friends and family," Tavarozzi said. The Web designer also sent out requests by e-mail and regular mail asking for donations.

Was the walk too long and hard for the miniature dogs? Absolutely not, Tavarozzi said. "We walk a couple of miles each day."

Many other prizes were given to dogs and their owners in a contest that included the longest tail, the best dressed, the smallest, the biggest and the dog and owner who look most alike.

Unfortunately, through all the excitement and hullabaloo, organizers didn't jot down all winners' names. That won't happen again, promised organizer Ginnie Hauck. "We'll certainly have that next year!" Judges for the contest were Canton Clerk Terry Bennett, Canton Supervisor Tom Yack and former state Sen. Loren Bennett.

When the walk was to begin, dogs and their owners lined up along the path ready for the start. Adults with kids and dogs in tow arranged themselves as neatly as possible for the trek. Some pulled wagons. Some came with cold drinks in hand. All held tightly to leashes, trying - some in vain - to maneuver their dogs in the right direction.

And right behind the entourage for four-legged and two-legged creatures followed Dennis Heminger, Carol's husband, who dutifully served as the pooper scooper man.

"She's basically lazy. She usually rests," said Gary Torzy, about his dog, Sheena, 3.

Further down the walk, Bill Ellis was walking neatly next to his 20-month-old pup, Murphy, a 160-pound English mastiff. "He is still going to grow," Ellis said, adding that when on his hind legs, Murphy stands at 5 feet, 5 inches tall.

"They are very gentle dogs,"

Murphy continued, adding that Murphy is a therapy dog and visits nursing homes and hospitals. "He is a big baby."

Casey, the wire fox terrier, decided when it was time to rest and sat in shade near a bench at the walk. A veteran Plymouth Dog Jog participant, Casey does what he can to help other canines and pets in need. "He has a great life. It doesn't hurt to donate," said his owner Kathy Kotula of Canton.

**DOGGIE DELIGHTS**

Many of the dogs were decked out for the walk and the contest for best dressed pooch. Some dogs sported decorations, while others were dressed to the nines in capes and hats and sweater-like attire.

"We got a doggie pattern," said Laurie Schroeder, who with her husband, Herb, walked Pepper, 4, a Labrador, and Sammie, 6, a shepherd-huskie mix. The couple decided to keep in the Liberty Fest mode with their dogs' patriotic wear. "We're just dog lovers," Laurie Schroeder said.

Not far from the search and rescue demonstrations oohs and aahs could be heard around a round ball of black fur - a six-week-old Newfoundland, owned by Sarah Priddy, who is a handler for a bloodhound who works in rescue.

"She uses her nose like crazy," Priddy said of the puppy, who passed a puppy search and rescue test with flying colors. "The test determines the capability of the dog doing the work."


Who knows whether the puppy - dubbed temporarily as Little Girl - will indeed become a search and rescue dog. That will be up to her new owners, whomever they may be.

her comic comrades, Michelle Daugherty, who owns the place along with her husband, Dave, is a good friend who happens to have an open microphone.

"When we first started, we were together like brothers and sisters," said Bailey, who brought comedy night to Boulders about a month ago. "We support each other, whether we bomb or kill."

So far, it's been a little of both, as the comics have tried to get the attention of Boulders' customers. Bailey said some of the early logistical problems are their own.

For instance, the group didn't do much pre-program publicity, so their appearance on that first night caught diners by surprise. Also, the first night they performed was the night of Game 7 of the Stanley Cup finals.

"That first night was bad, and I'm not sure (customers) were too happy to have us there (because of the hockey)," Bailey said, laughing at the memory.

"But we kept at it." The group has gotten a little better at publicity — they put out a flyer before Week 2 — and crowds have been more receptive. Bailey and her friends hope

the shows will become more popular as word of mouth spreads.

"This is another avenue for us," said Kimberly Knight, a comic from Taylor who went through the comedy school at Joey's Comedy Club in Livonia. "They've got a stage and a mike, and that's what we need."

Most of the comics are just getting started. Some have gone through the school at Joey's; others, like Bailey, were simply dared into it.

Bailey remembers her first time, back in February at the Comedy Castle in Royal Oak. A friend challenged her to get on stage, so she did. That's when she noticed the blotches — they come the more nervous she gets — but ignored them and gave it a shot.

"I totally bombed that night," she laughs now. "It was my first time, the place was packed. I had my routine, and I was raring to go, but I froze." Then, with a sense of pride, she said, "But they let me back in the next week."

Not that anyone thought she would come back. That was how Bailey met Knight, the Downriver comic who bases her act on observations of life.

Knight was in the audience that first night, and was back the following week.

But as her time neared, Bailey was nowhere to be seen.

"She was late, almost a no-show," recalls Knight. "I said, 'This girl isn't coming back,' but there she was. She showed a lot of courage."

It's the kind of perseverance young people need to show, especially in the comedy world, according to Maureen "Mo" Noland, a veteran manager of comics who is trying her hand at an on-stage act, as well.

Bombing, said Noland, is a part of the game.

"It's good to bomb, because you're either going to bounce back, or you're going to learn this isn't your thing," she said. "You have to work through your material, no matter how the audience is reacting, to learn what works and what doesn't."

The folks at Boulders don't mind the comics trying their acts out on the restaurant's stage. The restaurant isn't paying them, and Monday nights are good nights because there's nothing else scheduled.

"It doesn't cost us anything, so I let them use our stage and let them perform," said Michelle Daugherty. "They can do it as long as they want to. It can't hurt business."

The comics come from all over. Noland is from Dearborn, while Jason Hagle and Mark

Ratner live in Lansing. Charles Ramey came up from Philadelphia. Jason Abbott is from Northville. Laura Lu lives in Livonia.

The group knows each other mostly from other comedy clubs, like Joey's in Livonia. Some have gone through the school, others haven't. Some have larger comic aspirations, others are using it as a springboard to something else.

Bailey, whose routine consists "mostly of bashing my husband," is using it to try to quell her stage fright.

"My real passion is singing," she said. "I'd like to get over my stage fright. I figure if I get over the comedy, the singing will be a snap."

Knight finished the six-week comedy school about a year ago, she said, and has simply been trying to find a microphone and an audience. In that respect, Boulders has been a God-send.

"I did the six weeks of school, and they make you get up and do it," said Knight. "After that, you get as much stage time as you can. That's why this place is so great for us."

Comedy night at Boulders takes place around 9 p.m. Mondays. For more information, call the restaurant at (734) 459-4190.

accessory after the fact. Antal said she is being considered an accomplice, though she did not actually assist him in robbing the bank.

"She was aware of the bank robbery and still never reported it," Antal said. "She even went partying with him with money taken in bank robbery - she was aware as soon as she got in the car that the bank had been robbed."

For the Canton robbery, Sawaya was arraigned Thursday. He's facing charges of bank robbery, unarmed robbery and for being a habitual offender because of his alleged involvement in at least five bank robberies.

Both are being held in Wayne County Jail, him on \$100,000 cash bond for each

case, and she on \$10,000 cash bond for the Plymouth Township case. Both preliminary exams are set for June 30 in 35th District Court.

teller to put money in a magazine he carried, and walking out with the money tucked inside. Sawaya was ultimately arrested without incident at a gas station on Michigan Avenue four hours after the Canton bank robbery was reported. performed by the schools' symphony, concert and varsity bands as well as the jazz and wind ensembles and the marching band.

Some selections include *Little Beau Cool, Embraceable You, The Heat is On, Elasticity* (from the 2002 Marching Band Season), *La Mousisque, Bransle Quatre Bransles* and *Gainsborough* as well as the fight songs for Canton, Plymouth and Salem high schools.

"I think they'll be blown away by the quality of the sound and everything," Lorenz said of the tracks, which were recorded at various times and in various places.

In exchange for donating to the effort, businesses will get "stockholder certificates," and one "share" for each dollar donated.

Donor choices include the scholarship fund, instrument fund and the capital fund.

The scholarship fund, Lorenz said, is especially important. It costs marching band parents \$1,400 each school year for their kids to participate. Scholarships allow every student wanting to be in marching band to participate, even if their parents cannot afford it.

"In these trying economic times, many talented musicians cannot participate in the marching band because their parents are unable to afford it," Lorenz said.

As for the capital fund, the band needs some new equipment, like a semi-trailer to haul equipment, an industrial sewing machine to repair band uniforms and funds for auxiliary instructors to teach marching drills and the finer points of marching band music performance.

The instrument fund could use some help, too. Some of the instruments students are using are so old that they belonged to a high school that closed in 1970 - the original Plymouth High School, the current site of Central Middle

School. The proof is in the "PHS" initials engraved on some of the older instruments. The instrument wish list asks for mellophones, baritones, timpani drums, a marimba, soprano and baritone saxophones, a bass drum and more.

from another school district across the state," said Gerry Olessey, president of the Plymouth-Canton Music Boosters.

In its original form the bill would have called for a majority agreement, not a unanimous vote. But the State Police were not comfortable with that arrangement.

A similar bill, which is now in a House committee, was introduced in the Senate by State Sen. Bruce Patterson (R-Canton).

He and LaJoy, working together on their legislation, reached a compromise by requiring unanimous agreement. That satisfied the State Police, according to a spokeswoman in Patterson's office.

Since Wayne County does not have a road commission, language was added to the bill which would give the county executive a say in the matter in the case of a charter county with a population of two million or more and without a road commission.

It also includes a provision that would allow a township to

opt out of the process if they chose not to participate.

"Local officials know best which speed limits are the safest and most efficient for their area," he said. "Michigan townships, especially in western Wayne County, have grown rapidly and many of these rural county roads have become unsafe for pedestrians and motorists."

He said safety was a major concern behind the issue.

"Many times school children have to navigate these roads after being dropped off from school."

"The legislation will help make our roads safer while helping to ease congestion."


LaJoy said the bill was part of an ongoing effort to give townships more input in dealing with local concerns.

"It's a start," he said. "Townships were never allowed to have input into this process before. Is it perfect? Probably not, but it's a start. We have to work together to get things done."



# Crackdown on deadbeat parents creates a case logjam

Shannon Coffey thought she was finally going to be able to collect on the back child support owed to her 9-year-old son.

In April, Wayne County Prosecutor Mike Duggan held a press conference to announce that his office was instituting get-tough measures, and would prosecute 1,000 deadbeat parents this year.

Coffey, a Westland resident and single parent, is owed \$22,000 in back support from her son's father, and although she's had a case open with the Friend of the Court since 1995, she hasn't been able to collect a dime.

Buoyed with new hope, Coffey contacted the prosecutor's office and filled out the required paperwork. A week later, she

received a response stating that the system was overwhelmed.

No one, she says, was able to answer her questions.

"I called down and asked them 'How can you say you're overwhelmed? You haven't been doing anything the whole time, then you put it in the paper and showboat like you're going to do something, but you still don't,'" Coffey said. "They let me down."

## MOVING FORWARD

Assistant Wayne County Prosecutor Rebecca Tenorio agrees that the department was besieged after the announcement of the new Felony Non Support Unit, but, she says, the five full time prosecutors are moving forward with the crackdown.

"We received about 600 questionnaires as a result of that

press conference," said Tenorio. "We are extremely backed up, but we are moving as fast as we can."

Wayne County Prosecutor Mike Duggan was unavailable for comment.

Since the new operation officially began Jan. 1, 388 felony warrants have been issued in Wayne County, which will result in the collection of \$2 million in back child support.

"Our program is evolving. It's becoming more efficient and more effective, and we're getting (child support) money that people are seeing for the first time," said Nancy Neff, principal attorney in the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office. "People have to be patient, but we will get to every single case."

Neff said a representative from the prosecutor's office will interview the custodial parent

by phone, usually within 30 days of receiving the initial paperwork. Parents will then be informed as to whether a felony warrant will be issued for the non-supporting parent.

## WORST OF THE WORST

Each case is evaluated on an individual basis, she said, but the prosecutors office looks for certain criteria when deciding whether to issue a felony warrant: The non-custodial parent must live within the state, have the ability to pay, and have been previously unresponsive to civil sanctions issued by Friend of the Court.

"We're trying to take the worst of the worst, in situations where civil sanctions just haven't been effective," said Neff. "It's not the person who's missed 5 payments that's going to be charged with a felony. We're going after the most egregious of cases."

Generally, she said, the owing parent must also be in arrears of at least \$5,000, but that amount will vary by case depending on the monthly amount the parent has been ordered to pay.

"For some people, a debt of \$5,000 might mean they haven't paid in years," said Neff. "But for someone who has been ordered to pay \$1,000 a month, it means they're only behind 5 months."

Michigan ranks third to last in the nation when it comes to back child support, with about \$7 billion is owed to the state's children. Only parents in Texas and California owe more.

About \$3 billion of Michigan's outstanding child support is owed to Wayne County residents.

But the new Felony Non-Support Unit, deadbeat parents can face a criminal record and a four year prison term if they refuse to pay.

"We're arresting them almost as fast as we're getting (the warrants)," said Executive Lt. Kevin Losen, head of the Sheriff's Friend of the Court

Enforcement Unit. "We rely on information from custodial parents about where to find them, and we have our own ways of locating people, too."

Thus far, however, no parent has been sentenced to the four-year felony term.

"What we find is that when they're charged with a felony and they're looking at four years in prison they find the motivation they need," said Wayne County

Sheriff Warren Evans. "They all miraculously come to some agreement and find money they didn't have before."

## Magnetic strips speed up license renewal

The state Secretary of State's branch offices are speeding up the renewal process by retrieving data stored in magnetic strips on the back of licenses.

Each employee workstation now has a keyboard that is equipped with the magnetic-strip reader.

Retrieving data directly from the license eliminates the need to enter it manually. That provides faster and more accurate inputting.

From the customer's stand-

point, it helps to expedite license renewals and shorten waiting times.

Many law-enforcement agencies are making use of this technology as well. Because the magnetic strips are tamper-resistant, police can make certain that the data contained in the magnetic strips matches the information listed on front of the license.

By law, the magnetic strip contains no personal information other than the holder's

license number, date of birth and license expiration date.

About 10.5 million driver's licenses and 1.4 million personal identification cards - which include replacements for those that were lost or destroyed - have been issued since Michigan began using magnetic strips in April 1998.

A computer system installed last year in the branch offices now enables the department to take advantage of the magnetic strip capability.

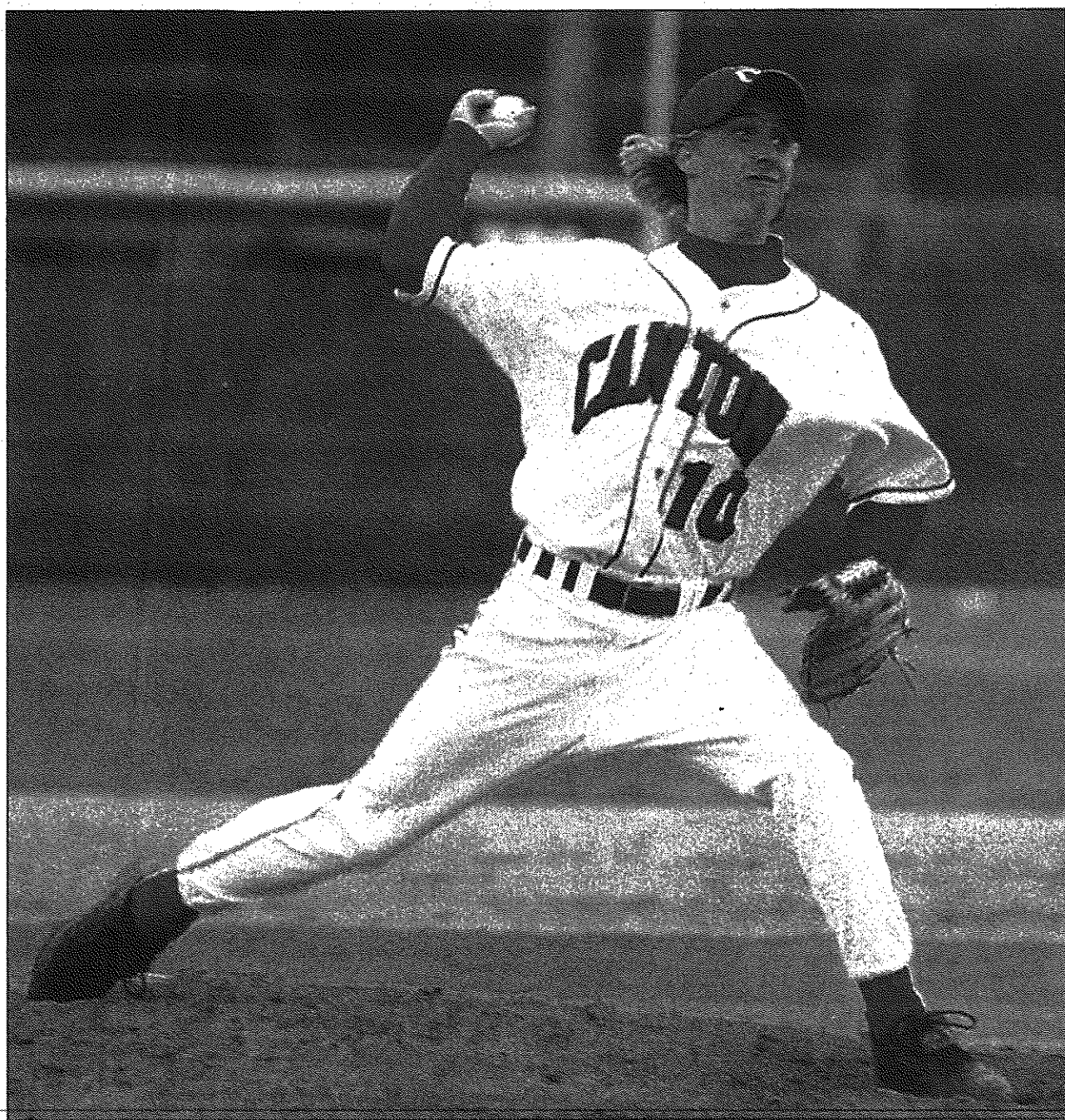

Wilkin, Waldron's all-time career leader in rebounds (1,076), earned All-State honorable mention honors as the Spartans, with an enrollment of 118, finished 19-4 and earned a trip to the Class D regional.

As a senior, the South Central Athletic Association MVP averaged 23 points, 15 rebounds, 3.8 blocks and 3.3 assists per game.

"We will be moving in with his sister who lives in Canton," Briggs said. "He's a guy who rebounds the ball and can face up to the basket and hit the 15-footer. He's a good student who has already taken 12 credit hours at Washtenaw (CC)."

## Bucks getting ready for Cup challenge

For a soccer team like the Mid-Michigan Bucks, it couldn't get much better than this.

First, the Bucks get into the biggest open soccer tournament in the country — the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, the oldest cup competition in U.S. soccer, dating back to 1914. To do so as a Premier Development League (or Division IV) team, they can't lose any of their first four matches; only six of 51 PDL teams qualify.

The Bucks do it, going 3-0-1 in that qualifying stretch.

Next, the Bucks send in their bids to host a match in a tournament that has nothing to do with the standings in the PDL or Mid-Michigan's Great Lakes Division. Their eventual reply is better than anyone could anticipate: The Bucks haven't just qualified for the

nation's biggest open tournament, they drew a first-round bye and they host the Long Island (N.Y.) Rough Riders, a Division III pro team, in the second round.

That game is set for 7:30 p.m. Wednesday at Berkley's Hurley Field.

Sounds great, doesn't it? "It's huge," said Jim Duggan, the Bucks' general manager and co-owner, in describing the Open Cup. "This is the biggest tournament in the country."

Yes, well, unfortunately, that's where the good news ends for the Bucks. After all, one must face the facts, and the fact is, a team made up mainly of college-level players will have a difficult time beating a professional team.

Duggan knows this. "We're not going to win the tournament," he admitted. "It's all

about getting our guys exposure. You can go to tryouts (with pro teams) all you want and it won't be the same thing."

Is that the only reason to play in a tournament you have no chance of winning?

"The goal," Duggan explained, "is always to get an opportunity to play an MLS (Major League Soccer) team."

Using that sort of perverse logic, the Bucks go into the Open Cup knowing that if they win their first match, they go up against a team (the New York/New Jersey MetroStars) that can and probably will win without any trouble. And the Bucks are happy about it.

Follow that odd reasoning and try to figure out why they'd want their fans on hand to witness the debacle. But they do.

"The reason getting a good crowd to Wednesday's game (against Long Island) is so

important is because they haven't decided who will host the next round yet," Duggan explained. In other words, should the Bucks beat the Rough Riders, they could conceivably host the MetroStars on July 16.

Not that the aforementioned is anything near a certainty. The Rough Riders, going into last weekend, were unbeaten (6-0-3) in the USL's Pro Select League.

"We've never seen 'em play," Duggan said. "They're better than any Division III team we've played before."

"The guys are going to have to be fired up."

Duggan added that the pros in Division III are "clearly a step up (but) most of our guys are capable of playing at that level."

So far a few Bucks have displayed that kind of talent. In the 10 matches they played

In addition to his wife Linda working with the sport of golf, Clark's son Kevin is attending the University of North Carolina on a golf scholarship, and his daughter Julie is a teacher in the Boca Raton, Fla., area.

Clark says his goals for the tournament are to create a fan-friendly sporting environment, which not only showcases the golfers who participate, but also gives fans a full entertainment experience.

One change he has implemented this year is for live music concerts at the venue after play ends each day of the tournament. Huey Lewis and the News headlines the groups who will be performing behind the 12th tee at TPC.

"Matt is one of the most underrated catchers in the area," Lutheran Westland coach Ted Younglas said. "He's been a real leader for us this year."

"Brian adjusted well moving from shortstop to third base," Stevenson coach Harv Weingarden said. "He a solid season defensively at third base."

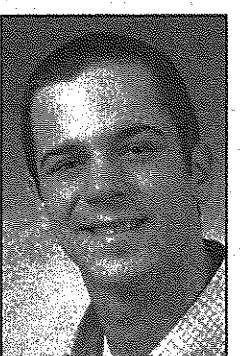
"He led us in sacrifices and still hit .4089. He's a good contact hitter. He uses all parts of the field."

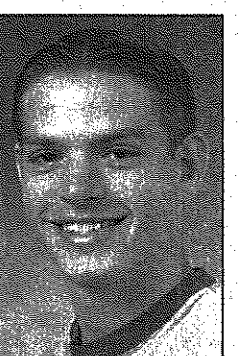
Rutkowski also excels in the classroom, sporting a grade-point average of 4.1.

# NFL player among Observerland's best

Even while he was battling cancer, Garden City native and former NFL linebacker Pete Wysocki believed in living life to the fullest.

On June 14, Wysocki, who made his mark in the National Football League as a special teams player and linebacker for the Washington Redskins, passed away after a three-year bout with cancer at age 55, in his home in Vienna, Va.

In 2000, Wysocki was named one of Observerland's 50 Greatest Athletes and in 1993 he was inducted into Western Michigan University's Athletic Hall of Fame.

"He was going out riding motorcycles with his son (Bannon) — out on a track, of course," said former WMU teammate Sam Antonazzo. "He told me was going about 135 to 140 miles an hour. And I'm thinking this guy is sick?"

Wysocki's outstanding football career was realized when he first made his mark a standout wide receiver during his days at Garden City High. He graduated from the school in 1965.

Antonazzo, who played at Livonia Franklin and later teamed up with Wysocki from 1966-68 at WMU, remembers hearing about Wysocki catching

25 consecutive passes in high school.

"It was something like that, just incredible statistic," said Antonazzo, who teaches in the Waterford Public Schools.

Wysocki lettered as a sophomore wide receiver on WMU's 1966 co-Mid-American Conference championship team, but couldn't quite crack the Broncos' starting lineup.

"The summer before his junior year he got into (weight) lifting, he started working out like crazy and his arms got so big and his chest was so huge that he couldn't raise his arms above his head to catch the ball any more," Antonazzo recalls. "He still kept his quickness, but then they moved him to offensive guard and he was like a fish out of water."

Wysocki did not letter his junior year, but came back for his senior year and started at inside linebacker. Despite weighing 200 pounds, he earned second-team All-MAC honors. His greatest college memory was playing against the backfield of Mercury Morris and Dwayne Thomas of West Texas State.

"Even though we didn't have a very good season (3-6), he was

our heart-and-soul, very inspirational and gung-ho," Antonazzo said. "They made him a linebacker and he did very well."

While Antonazzo was ready to get on with a teaching career, Wysocki decided to give the Canadian Football League a shot after going undrafted by the NFL.

"In 1969 he wanted me to go to Toronto with him and try out, back then you had to play both ways in the CFL," Antonazzo recalled. "He had a wife and kid at the time, and I thought he was nuts. After he got cut by Toronto, he drove up to Sashkatchewan (Roughriders)."

Wysocki played four years in the CFL including stops with Hamilton (1971), Toronto (1972) and the Roughriders (1973-74) before earning a spot with the Redskins in 1975. The All-CFL linebacker also played a year of semi-pro football with the Norfolk (Va.) Neptunes.

"Pete used to work out here in the summers at Vic Tanny's with Joe Schmidt and Mike Lucci of the Lions and they talked to George Allen (the Redskins' coach) about him," Antonazzo recalls. "They told George you really ought to take a look at this guy."

Wysocki signed as a free agent with Washington and

quickly made his mark as a special teams player, a "wedge-buster," who charged down the field with reckless abandon and made aggressive hits.

Because of his aggressive style, along with being the team's resident comedian, the 6-foot-1, 233-pound Wysocki quickly became a popular soundbite with the media and a fan favorite in D.C.

Wysocki played six years in Washington, earning a start in the 1979 opener for coach Jack Pardee against Philadelphia. He retired prior to the 1981 season.

During his post NFL career, Wysocki, who was a Fine Arts major at WMU, became an advertising salesman for WMAL-AM.

He also was a commercial real estate agent, announcer at University of Maryland games, volunteered at soup kitchens, organized charity golf events, raised bulldogs, did cycling and enjoyed racing Triumph and BMW motorcycles.

After being diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma in 1999, Wysocki spoke at gatherings for the Leukemia Society and raised money for research.

"He may have been a different guy on the field, but off it Pete was happy-go-lucky, a great guy that everybody liked," Antonazzo said.

to Jacksonville (Tex.) where he averaged 8.8 points in 11 games. Bibbs shot 41 percent from the floor and 74 percent from the free-throw line as Jacksonville finished 17-14 overall.

"We're looking to bring in four or five more," said Briggs, who sent seven players off last year's squad to the Division I ranks including Marcus Bennett (UNC-Charlotte), Torvoris Baker (Detroit Mercy), Andre Scott (New Mexico State), James Holmes (South Florida), Gary Johnson (Central Florida), Ronald Dorsey (McNeese State) and Dion Sherrell (Wyoming).

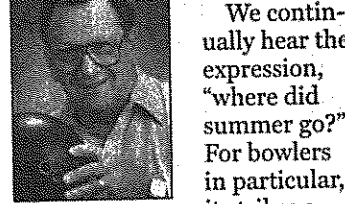

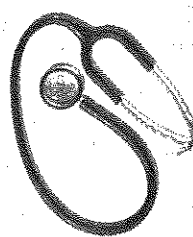

## Get help for blues after birth

This week we begin a new column by Lisa Kruman, a clinical social worker at the Davis Counseling Center in Farmington Hills. She will answer questions from new parents about their concerns. Kruman has more than 10 years experience working with children, adolescents, adults, couples and families.

**Lisa:** I am depressed and feeling anxious since I had my baby two weeks ago. I have heard a lot about postpartum blues. I feel more than "blue." How serious is this and what should I do?  
**Jane D., Livonia**

**Dear Jane:** Postpartum blues occurs frequently as a result of normal hormonal changes that occur shortly after delivery. The symptoms range from mild to moderate and usually do not last for an extensive period of time. For some women the effect of the hormonal changes is more severe. If your symptoms continue after several weeks post delivery, and are interfering with your daily overall functioning, you may be experiencing a more severe form - called postpartum depression. The symptoms may include but are not limited to anxiety, depression, obsessive thinking, agitation, irritability, insomnia, hyperinsomnia, lack of motivation, frequent crying, fear of caring for the baby as well as thoughts of harming yourself or your baby. Mental health treatment, sometimes combined with medication, is very successful in treating postpartum depression.

**Lisa:** When I had my first baby three months ago I imagined that everything would be "wonderful." Since she was born, my life has changed so much and I'm feeling resentful. Is this normal and how can I feel more positive?  
**Mary S., Farmington**

**Dear Mary:** Our fantasy of life with a new baby is often different from the reality. Your identity has changed in numerous ways, as have your responsibilities in your life. Many women go through a grieving process over these losses and experience some feelings of resentment. While you need to acknowledge the losses and changes in your life, you need to make a conscious effort to also acknowledge the gains and the new experiences you will have along this new journey of motherhood. Remember that at this early stage you are sleep deprived and constantly giving to your baby without much feedback. As your baby grows and begins to respond to you, you will likely begin to enjoy motherhood more.

**Lisa:** Since our baby was born eight months ago, we have become so focused on him that we have lost our connection with each other. How can we keep our marriage strong with the busy daily routine and needs of our baby?  
**John M., Farmington Hills**

**Dear John:** While a child certainly requires significant time and attention, it is very important to remember that your marriage does too. You will probably need to create this time, as it will not necessarily naturally occur. Although it may seem impossible, make every

## Plymouth producer sees film vision turn to reality

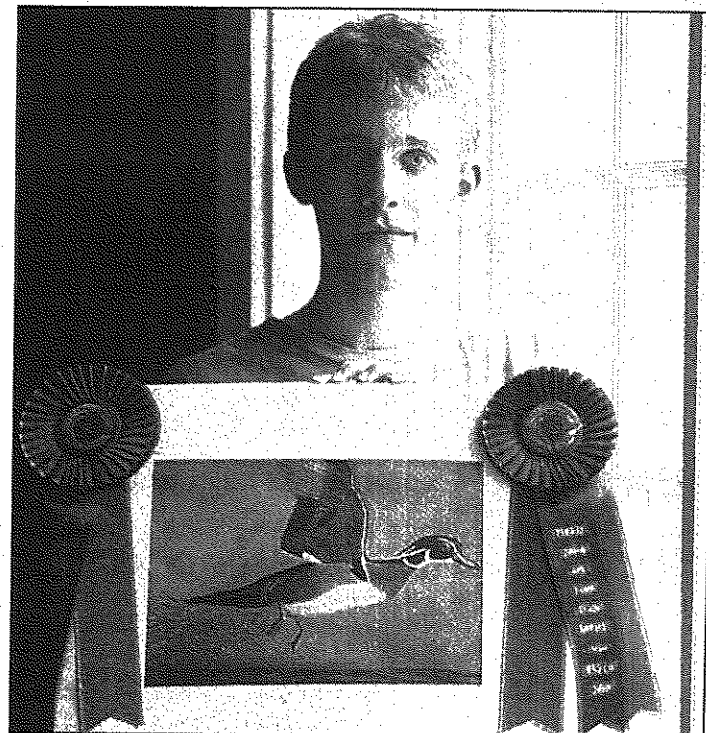
"The whole idea of the Monart program is everyone can produce something like this," Soubly said.

accolades he'd get if he attended a brick-and-mortar school."

Soubly has taken lessons from the same teacher - Nancy VanAlstyne - since he started at the Monart school eight years ago. The relationship began when Learned met VanAlstyne during a home-schooling conference.

"She showed me some of the work created by kindergarten-

ers," Learned recalled. "I thought, 'Kevin could do that.'"

An easy transition? Hardly. Odom eventually took a job at The Henry Ford, where she works on the Firestone Farm, an 1885 farmhouse where they wear period clothing and work the farm as farmers did in 1885.

The job suited Odom's passion for history, and also gave her the knowledge she'd eventually use to make period films. It also introduced her to Brian Egen, her boss, friend and, now, partner. She noticed she and Egen shared a thirst for history, and she noticed another thing about him.

"I started to notice that Brian worked really hard, and I admired that," said Odom, who grew up in the area and graduated from Canton High School in 1982. "I work hard, too, and I appreciate that in other people."

The pair got to talking and decided they wanted to do a project together. Egen recalled reading the Ambrose Bierce story on which *Occurrence* is based in high school. It is frequently used as a teaching tool in film classes, and a French film based on the story won an

Oscar in the 1960s.

"This story is a fascinating story," said Egen, a historic district manager at The Henry Ford. "It has all the primary vices of dramatic story structure — man vs. man, man vs. nature. That was a major consideration, as well as the fact it was a manageable size for a short film. It also offered an opportunity to do a period piece, which appealed to both of us."

In order to get the film made, Odom and Egen formed Owl Creek Productions in June 2000, and started in earnest trying to get the film made. While Egen is the creative force behind the project, Odom took on the role of executive producer and handled most of the business end of the production.

"Making movies is not for the faint of heart," she said with a smile. "You have to be willing to put yourself on the line, and you have to be willing to hear 'no' a lot."

She heard it enough, but overcame it to get the movie made. Shot entirely on location — in North Carolina, West Virginia and some in Michigan — the movie tells the story of Peyton Farquhar, a man torn between his passionate devo-

tion to his family and fierce notions of patriotism for his country during the time of the Civil War.

Perfectionists both, Odom and Egen made everything authentic, right down to the button holes on Farquhar's clothing. Odom didn't want to leave anything to chance in producing the Civil War-era aura for her first film.

"When you look at them individually, those little things don't seem like much," Odom said. "Viewers might not even notice them. But when you put them all together, it can make the film look more fake."

There were other challenges for the rookie producer, whose self-described job description included "making sure everything is there so everyone can do their job at the time they need to do it."

Part of that meant overseeing the budget. For instance, the North Carolina set was a bridge over a river, where alligators lolled. Crew members told Odom she'd need to have an alligator wrangler on hand just in case.

She balked, then agreed. As it turned out, it was money well-spent, because the guy had to earn his keep.

"If I hadn't paid that guy his

\$250 (daily fee), everything would have stopped," Odom recalled, laughing. "That would have cost us a lot more than \$250."

A very organized person adept at multi-tasking, Odom's nature came in handy with the business aspects as Egen concentrated on the creative force behind the movie.

"I'm more creative," said Egen, who has a degree in history. "Susan is a great produc-

er, she's great as an organizer of projects and processes. We both sort of handle everything, but that's how we cleaved the responsibilities."

With the premier in the rearview mirror, Egen and Odom are taking *Occurrence*, which runs just less than an hour, on the festival circuit to try to attract some commercial interest. Odom is applying to show it at the Toronto Film Festival, and the film has drawn some interest from distributors in California and Arkansas.

"We're looking at this as a 'calling card' project," Egen said. "It demonstrates our capabilities, shows what we can do."

As she turns her attention to the future — the duo has tentative plans to do a documentary on the War of 1812 — Odom says she learned a lot from this adventure.

"This is a partnership, and sometimes I want my own way too much," Odom said of her toughest lesson learned. "I had to learn to listen to what other people want and think. This has been a big chunk of my life. It was an adventure."

effort to find 30 minutes/day that you and your wife can spend together with no disruptions, i.e. telephone, T.V. etc. Also, during that time do not discuss your child. If you are fortunate enough to have a babysitter, or family member, that can stay a week for a few hours, take advantage of it. The baby will not suffer from being left with another safe caregiver for a short time, but he will react if his parents are disconnected from one another and your relationship is strained.

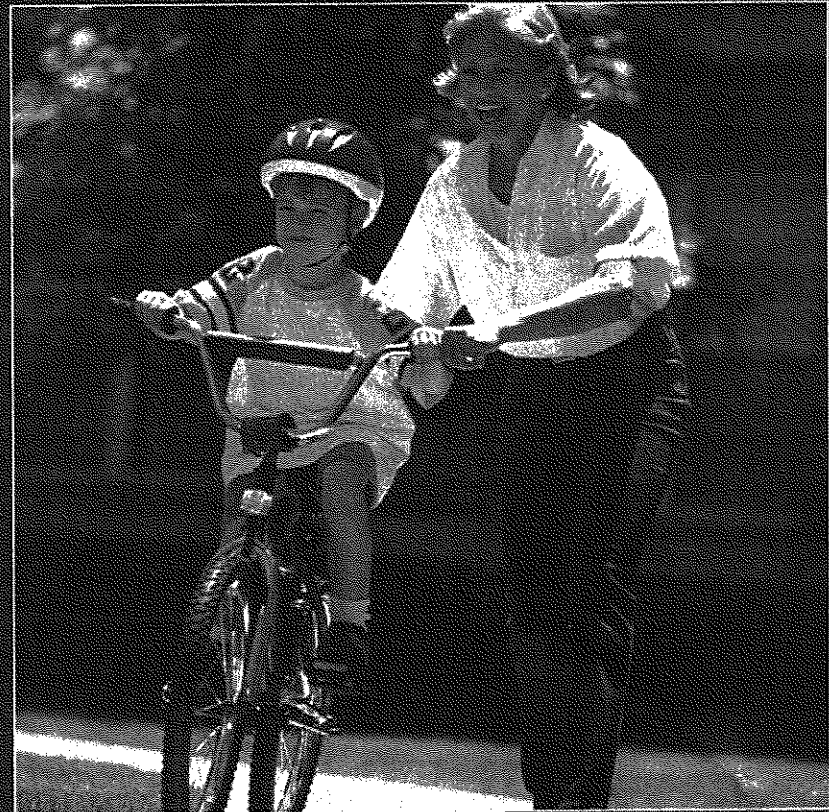

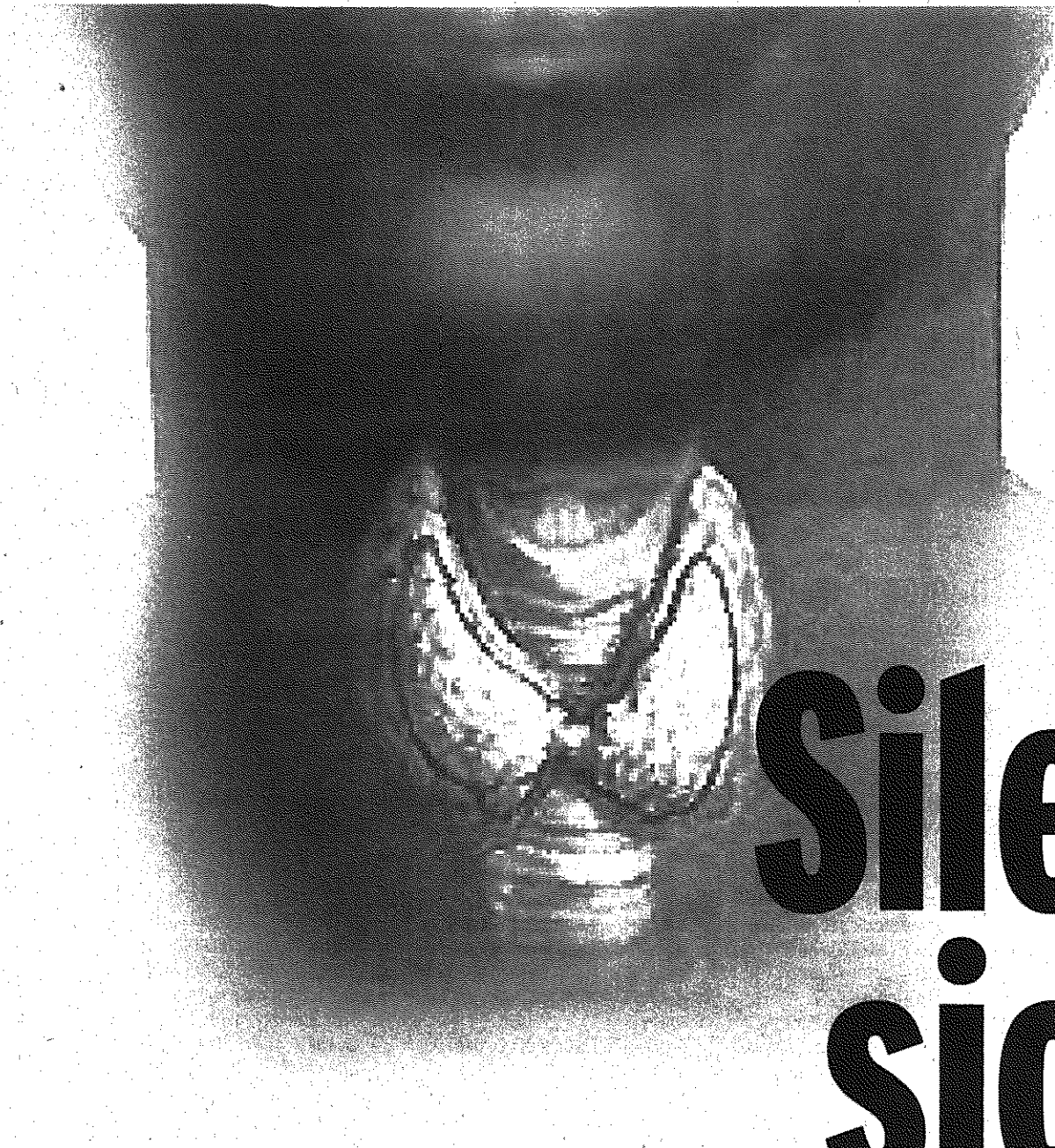

## Inherited disease Hypothyroidism drains energy

Looking back, Kevin Kitz of Canton says he should have anticipated the possibility of developing thyroid disease, because both his grandmother and his father had it.

A competitive runner in high school whose performance began to deteriorate, Kitz said, "I thought I was just lazy and kept telling myself I wasn't trying hard enough."

Diagnosed nine years ago at age 34 with Hashimoto's disease, a type of hypothyroidism, Kitz was surprised no one thought of it sooner. "In high school, I experienced extreme fatigue and I remember girls asking me if I plucked my eyebrows (Difficulty regrowing hair is one symptom of the disease). I had itchy skin, cold intolerance and severe brain fog. I felt like I was moving in slow motion."

Treated with Synthroid, a thyroid replacement hormone, Kitz immediately noticed improvement when he developed tremendous hunger - something he hadn't experienced for a long time. Kitz now has children and plans to have baseline thyroid testing done soon in case they inherit thyroid disease.

### RUNS IN FAMILIES

A butterfly-shaped organ at the base of the neck, the thyroid gland influences the metabolic rate - or energy utilization - of all the cells of the body. Hypothyroidism occurs when the levels of thyroid hormones are too low and the functions of the body slow down significantly.

Dr. Vicki Collins said thyroid disease "usually runs in

families and is caused by antibodies against the thyroid gland. In some people, the body thinks the thyroid is foreign tissue."

Collins, of Farmington Family Physicians PC, said hypothyroidism is more common in women than men and that most people diagnosed are over 40. Blood tests, specifically the TSH (thyroid-stimulating hormone) and T7 test are used in diagnosis. "People usually complain of fatigue, the inability to lose weight, coarse hair, constipation, heavy menstrual periods, and I see carpal tunnel syndrome as well," said Collins.

Treatment with thyroid hormone is usually lifelong, Collins said, as the thyroid gland tends to decrease in activity over time. Before supplementation was available, "Hypothyroidism could be a fatal condition," she said. "It is such a serious disease if not treated, though it may be viewed as minor because it can be easily treated."

### DEBILITATING DISEASE

Plymouth resident Linda Alvarado also has hypothyroidism and said it is "a condition that causes profound individual and family dysfunction. If I had had an arm and a leg amputated, (others) would have understood that I was unable to do certain tasks and made allowances."

One may look perfectly healthy while suffering from debilitating thyroid disease, she added.

Alvarado first noticed symptoms after giving birth; she was unable to lose weight and became increasingly tired and slow. A teacher, she eventually had to cut her

# U-M scientists trigger new hair growth in mice

University of Michigan graduate student David Van Mater knew something strange was going on when he noticed stubble on the shaved skin of experimental mice in his laboratory. Instead of the tumors he had originally expected to see, the mice were growing hair.

Van Mater had stumbled on the discovery that beta-catenin ("bay-tuh-kuh-TEEN-in"), a signaling protein involved in embryonic development and several types of cancer, also triggers changes in adult mouse hair follicles that lead to the growth of new hair.

The discovery by Van Mater and U-M scientists Drs. Frank T. Kolligs, Andrzej A. Dlugosz and Eric R. Fearon will be published in the May 15 issue of *Genes & Development*.

"Other researchers have shown that beta-catenin and other genes in the Wnt ("wint") pathway are important for normal development of hair follicles in embryos and after birth," says Dlugosz, an associate professor of dermatology in the U-M Comprehensive Cancer Center. "What's new about our study is the finding that a brief activation of beta-catenin in resting hair follicles could be enough to trigger the complex series of changes it takes to produce a normal hair."

The original purpose of the research study was to learn how the Wnt signaling pathway and beta-catenin are connected to cancer development, according to Fearon, the Emanuel N. Maisel Professor of Oncology in

the U-M Cancer Center.

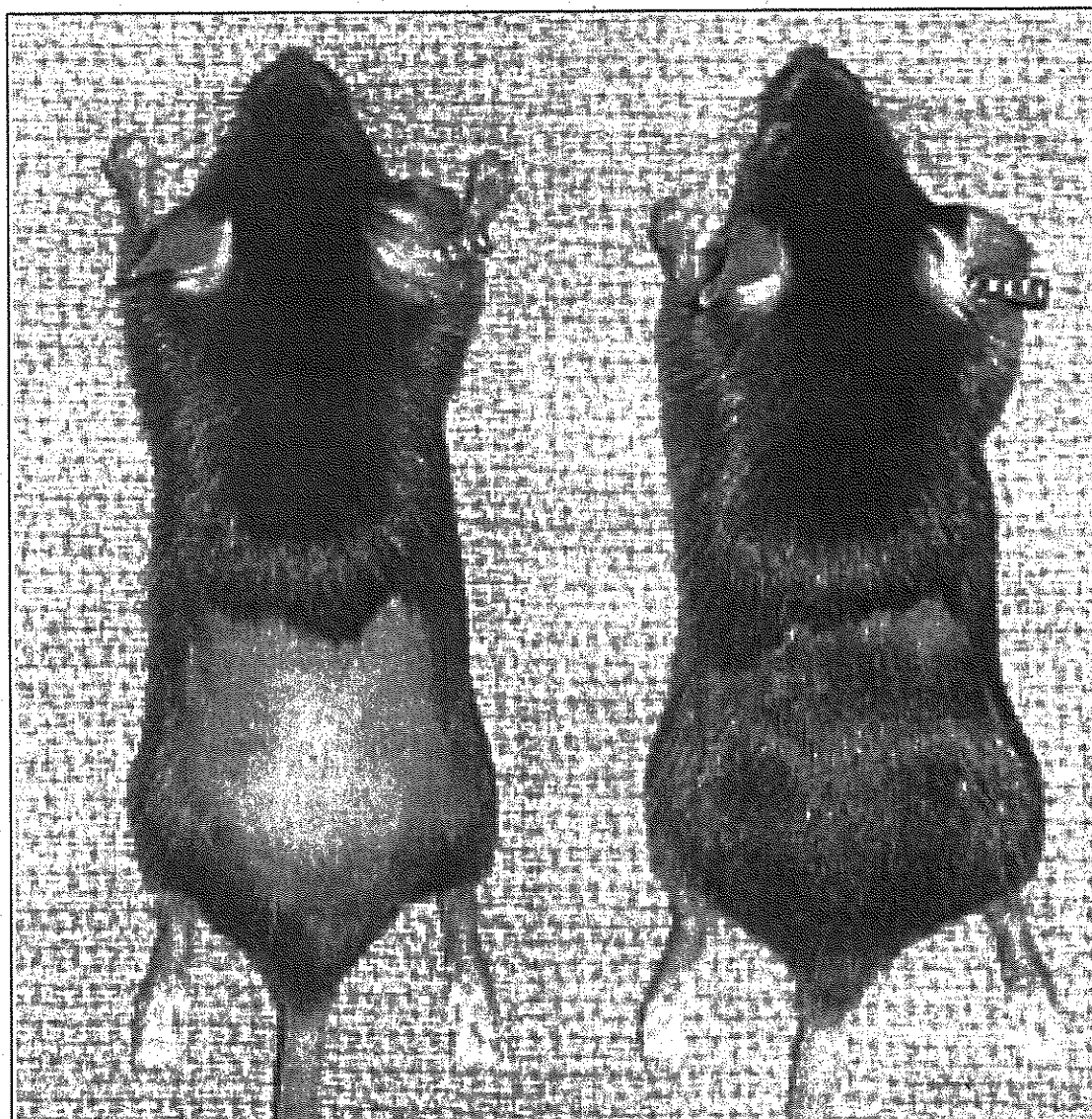
"Beta-catenin carries signals from growth factors called Wnts to the cell's nucleus," Fearon says. "If beta-catenin expression in the cell isn't adequately controlled and regulated, it changes normal patterns of gene expression. This can lead to several types of cancer, especially colon cancer."

## STUDY

The study used genetically altered mice developed in the U-M Transgenic Animal Model Core. By adding a packaged set of genes called a construct to fertilized mouse eggs, U-M researchers created a new strain of transgenic mice with an inducible form of beta-catenin in their skin cells and hair follicles.

Van Mater induced beta-catenin signaling activity by applying a chemical called 4-OHT to shaved areas on the backs of the transgenic mice and matched control mice with normal beta-catenin genes. This chemical turned on the beta-catenin in the skin and follicles of the transgenic mice. The plan was to use 4-OHT to turn on beta-catenin activity in the transgenic mice until skin tumors developed, and then turn off beta-catenin activity to see if the tumors disappeared.

"But we never saw tumors — just massive hyperplastic growth of hair follicle cells," Van Mater says. The scientists also noticed other skin changes that suggested an exaggerated

growth phase of the hair cycle. Dlugosz suggested applying 4-OHT just once, instead of every

day, and to do it during the hair follicles' resting phase or telogen phase.

"Hair follicles are like a mini-organ in the body," explains Van Mater, a graduate student in

the U-M Medical School's Medical Scientist Training Program. "Unlike most organs in the adult body, hair follicles go through regular cycles of growth, regression and rest. They are able to regenerate completely during each growth phase. Previous studies had suggested that a Wnt signal might be the switch that drives resting hair follicles into the active growth phase. By treating the transgenic mice with a single application of 4-OHT, we hoped to mimic the effect of a short pulse of Wnt expression in normal mice."

So Van Mater started over — applying 4-OHT just once to the shaved backs of transgenic mice and normal mice during the telogen phase of the hair cycle. Fifteen days later, the transgenic mice needed another shave, but there were no signs of new hair growth on the control mice.

"Our findings suggest some potential strategies for inducing hair growth, but it is premature to think these results will lead to new approaches for treating common male-pattern baldness," Dlugosz cautioned. "Many hair follicles in bald and balding men are greatly reduced in size, so merely reactivating hair growth would not produce a normal hair. Also, activation of beta-catenin in the body would need to be tightly regulated, since uncontrolled beta-catenin activity can lead to tumors of hair follicle cells or tumors in other sites, such as the colon, liver or ovary."

schedule to part time and was once restricted to bed for months after a bout with the flu.

Though her route to proper diagnosis and health was a circuitous one, Alvarado now takes natural Armour thyroid replacement hormone and feels alive again.

Beaumont endocrinologist Dr. Charles Taylor and his associates see 20,000 thyroid patients every year, half of whom have hypothyroidism. It's a common disorder; 5-10 women experience hypothyroidism for every man.

One in 4,500 children are born without a thyroid gland, something routinely screened for at birth nationwide. Once born mentally retarded and referred to as cretins, these infants are now treatable from birth.

"There is a very significant relationship between thyroid and pregnancy," Taylor said. "In pregnant women on thyroid hormone, the need increases significantly in the third month of pregnancy. Retrospective studies have been done which tested IQs of babies. Of 1,000 women, 64 were hypothyroid, and those women's infants had significantly decreased IQs."

"The main test we use (to diagnose hypothyroidism) is (a) pituitary (function) test, (which tells whether) there is or is not enough thyroid hormone there. Most endocrinologists treat hypothyroidism with one of four synthetic products containing thyroxine (T4), a hormone secreted by the thyroid," said Taylor, who doesn't treat people with low to normal thyroid levels because he believes "the tests are too sensitive."

## CHOLESTEROL PROBLEMS

Contrary to popular belief, Taylor said hypothyroidism does not cause people to gain massive amounts of weight, though there may be some weight gain. In addition to the symptoms listed above, the specialist in hormone disorders also sees patients experience leg cramping without apparent cause.

Taylor adds, "If your cholesterol is elevated, you should be certain it's not thyroid-related. I have had patients whose cholesterol was over 400 go to under 200 with treatment."

Dr. David Brownstein, medical director for the Center for Holistic Medicine in West Bloomfield has authored the book, *Overcoming Thyroid Disorders*, (Medical Alternatives Press, West Bloomfield, Mich.) and calls the prevalence of hypothyroidism "staggering."

In addition to diagnostic blood tests, Brownstein also employs basal temperature readings and clinical presentation. "Relying solely on blood tests will miss 30 percent individuals with hypothyroidism," said Brownstein, who believes 40 percent of the U.S. population suffers from hypothyroidism, many undiagnosed.

Brownstein also believes hypothyroidism "may be implicated in two epidemic diseases, chronic fatigue immune deficiency syndrome and fibromyalgia," and he often utilizes thyroid replacement hormone for these disorders with reported success. He also said a low level of thyroid hormone may be the culprit in many cases of infertility.

Brownstein explained that the thyroid gland produces two

major hormones: Thyroxine (T4) and Triiodothyronine (T3), both of which influence the "energy work" of the cells in all the body's organs. When there are adequate amounts of these chemicals, the body functions normally, but if the levels are too low, the body's metabolism reflects this with a slower rate.

While many practitioners diagnose hypothyroidism on the basis of the TSH test (thyroid-stimulating hormone), Brownstein said it is possible for a person to have normal T4 and TSH levels while the T3 level may be low.

"Many people do not adequately convert T4 into T3 and thus will be hypothyroid even though the TSH test falls within the normal range."

One of Brownstein's patients

with hypothyroidism is Tracy Green, who said her treatment of liver-cleansing regimen, dietary changes, and hormone replacement quickly "made a difference. Within a week, I was 70 percent better."

Green's problem was finding the right doctor; she visited eight doctors before finding Brownstein and treatment that was effective.

As a result of her experience, Green began a support group in 1999, which grew from an initial

membership of seven people to over 500 members at present. Meetings usually include professional speakers, and doctors also frequently attend "figuring out what thyroid patients have been telling them for years," said Green. Linda Alvarado attends the Plymouth support group and said, "Being around people who actually understand is one of most relieving aspects of the group."

The group meets the second

**FOOT PAIN**  
If asked, many people would say that the most common cause of foot pain is gout. That isn't the case, as few people have gout and many individuals experience foot pain. Another cause for foot pain that receives more prominence than it deserves, is heel spurs. The appearance of a spur on X-ray usually represents aging changes and presents in many individuals with no foot discomfort.

Probably the most likely reason for sore feet is improper shoes. As you age, your feet get bigger, not longer, but wider. The change is due to decreased ability of the veins of the leg to carry blood back to the heart. Eventually this back up shows itself as swelling in the feet. The swelling comes on as the day progresses because the blood flow back to the heart decreases when you are standing or sitting. Therefore, you can put on your shoes in the morning with little or no difficulty. At the end of the day what you notice is that you feel pain either on top of your foot, or on the inside or out edge of your foot. These are the sites where the swollen foot will press against the shoe. The treatment, as you can imagine, is a wider shoe.

Medical problems that cause foot pain include rheumatoid arthritis, osteoarthritis, and psoriatic arthritis. In each condition, the foot pain can begin before you show other signs that would make the reason for foot pain apparent. You should not be surprised if your doctor asks questions about your other joints or takes blood test as well as x-rays when your concern is your foot.

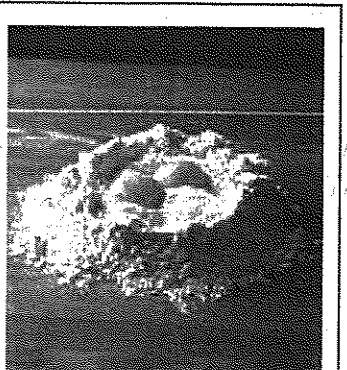

"It's a great location with easy access to M-14 and I-275," Guoin said.

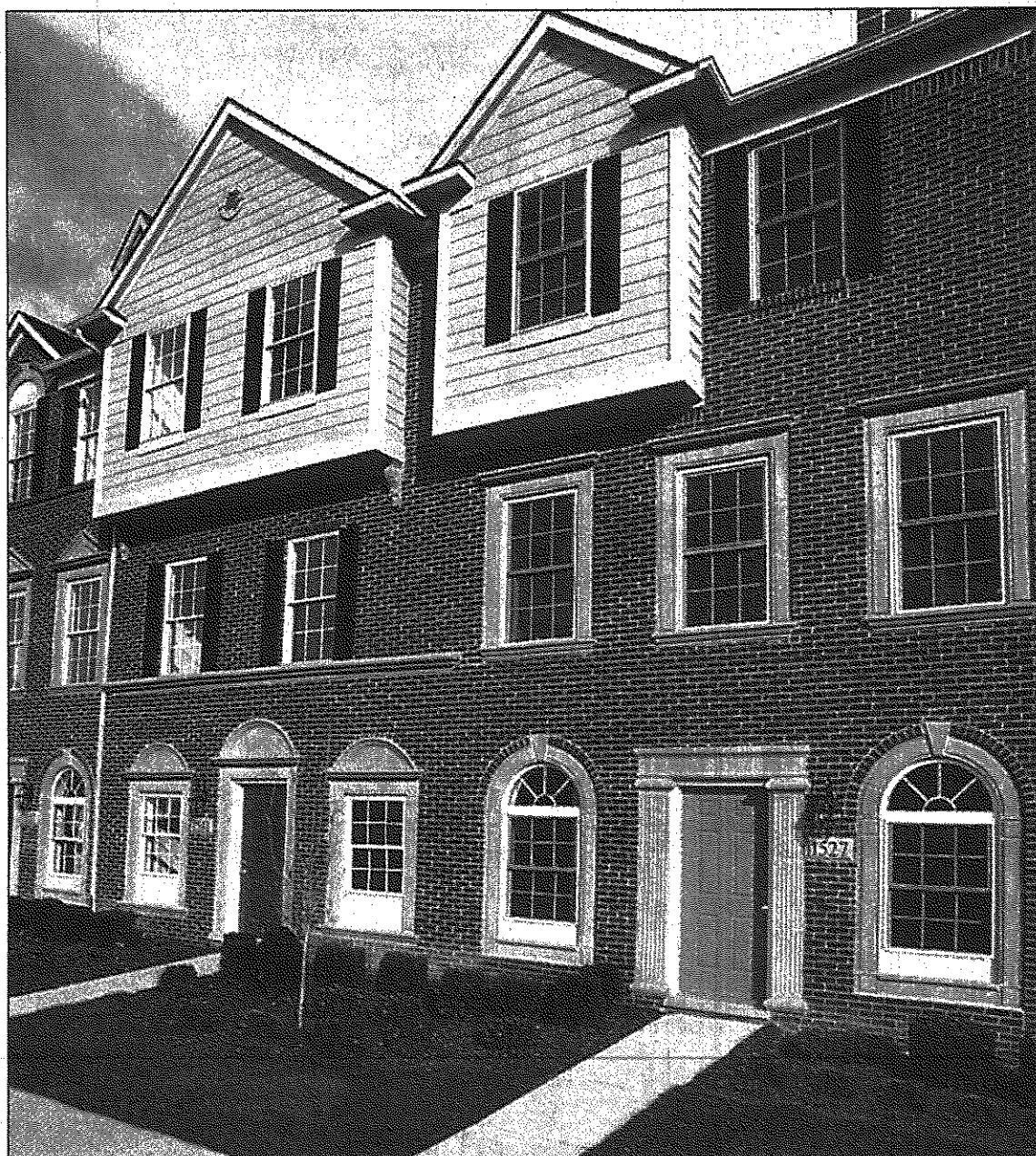
The Plymouth-Canton schools also enjoy a good reputation, Etterbeek said.

# Water-pumping windmills make a comeback at ponds

(AP) - Fat game fish break the pond's surface soon after Jim Crouch casts handfuls of food pellets on the waters.

Monster catfish, crappie, and bass dwell in the 25-foot depths of the 1-1/2-acre pond behind his home in Ottawa Lake southwest of Monroe (Mich.) The water is clear and blue-green.

"If you have a pond and you want it to be a healthy pond, you have to aerate it in some way, shape or form," says Crouch, a retired UPS driver who's developed a new business out of thin air.

Crouch sells windmills. Windmills once were as common in rural America as barns, but most still standing are monuments to a bygone lifestyle - a time when windmills were needed to pump water from the ground to irrigate cattle, crops and people.

Now they seem to be making a comeback.

Water-pumping windmills still can be had. But Crouch is selling air-pumping windmills to help country-dwellers keep healthy oxygen levels in their fish ponds and swimming holes.

One stands near the edge of his pond, its spinning prop a blur in an 18 mph breeze. Out in the middle of the pond, air bubbling up from beneath the surface breaks the wavelets caused by surface wind.

After installing his own windmill about five years ago, Crouch started Windmill's Pond Aeration, selling and installing kits made by Koenders Windmills Inc., a Saskatchewan firm.

Business truly has been brisk. He started slowly, but the business has grown and he now he's selling more than 100 a year, mainly in southern Michigan and northern Ohio.

Each windmill comes with a mechanical air compressor that is spun by a 6-foot-diameter, 12-blade propeller, directed into the wind by metal tail feathers.

"All you need is a 5 mph wind to make 35 pounds of air pressure," Crouch explains. The compressed air is fed down a plastic tube leading to an air stone that diffuses the oxygen at the bottom of the pond - an arrangement that's much like an aquarium but on a much larger scale.

The air circulates the stagnant bottom water, helps break down plant and animal waste and promotes zooplankton that consumes unwanted algae, Crouch says.

Results are noticeable within two weeks of starting the operation.

"It's amazing how much it will clear up a dirty pond," says Bart Sarkisian, who helps Crouch build

and install the windmills.

"The nice thing about it is you're not putting money into it all the time," Crouch says.

The windmills are designed to be used in place of the electric compressors that many pond operators have. Though compressors can chew up \$35 to \$40 monthly in electricity, the windmills use only wind power, Crouch says.

Crouch supplies 12-, 16- or 20-foot towers for the windmills. The kits are mainly galvanized steel and are anchored to the ground with a combination of steel rods and concrete.

Customers can assemble and erect the windmills themselves, it's a 12-to-15-hour job, or hire Crouch to put them up.

Prices for the do-it-yourself range from \$750 to \$850, depending on the size. If Crouch assembles, delivers and installs one, it can tack

on another \$375 to \$550.

Jack Sturn of Monroe bought a 20-foot model about a year ago for his 1-to-2-acre pond. "We've never had a problem before, but I do have fish in it," he says.

"So far, I'm real happy with it," he said. "People come in and see it and I'm really surprised how much people pay attention to it."

Sturn said he disconnects in the winter because children skate on the pond and the air stone will keep ice from forming.

Crouch keeps his windmill connected in winter, allowing for a 12-foot circle of open water. That benefits the pond by allowing more sunlight in, allowing gases to escape and keeping the water oxygen-rich despite most of the ice cover, he said.

There's also an aesthetic advantage. "It's a nice-looking piece of equipment sitting out there," Crouch added.

# Habitat house is all built with nowhere to go April excellent month for new house sales

(AP) - Margaret Townsend's miracle house seems to float above the lawn in Eastville on Virginia's Eastern Shore.

If you look under the white siding shimmering in the sun, though, you can see the timbers, stacked like Lincoln Logs, and the thick steel beams of a very patient house mover.

There are no front steps, no doorbell - no doorknob, for that matter. The house was finished last spring and parked temporarily, all thought, on Northampton High School's lawn last fall.

Now they refer to it as "The House Without a Home."

Townsend, 44, has been waiting patiently for a year, her belongings all packed, her faith strong. There's not much else she can do.

"The Lord will bless me," she said. "But when I come and look, I say, 'That's my house.'"

Someday, she knows, she and her two teenage children will be able to leave their rental place, which lacks plumbing, a few miles up the road and settle into their new house.

Then they won't have to carry buckets of water from the well out back for baths or walk through a dark yard, worried about snakes, to use the outhouse.

No one figured finding the family a new address would be so difficult.

On the Eastern Shore, there's only one thing as abundant as the poverty, and that's land. When Northampton County school

officials approached the local chapter of Habitat for Humanity in 2001, it seemed the perfect marriage.

Shop students at the high school needed practical experience in the building trades.

The county, one of the state's poorest, was desperate for affordable housing. Habitat had decided to increase its annual goal on the Eastern Shore from one to four homes and was looking for volunteer labor.

"We have the kids. We have the time," explained John Downing, the county's director of career and technical education, who came up with the partnership idea after visiting a construction apprenticeship program in Hampton Roads. "And good old Habitat has the money."

So in the fall of 2001, students began building a house using Habitat plans and materials behind the high school's Center for Careers and Technology.

It was a quantum leap beyond the sheds and doghouses and tear-apart walls that the trainees used to cobble together in their classrooms.

Students set up power poles and learned to tap into the electricity, as if on a real-world construction site. They framed the house and wore harnesses and cables to shingle the steeply pitched roof.

The electrical and plumbing classes did the wiring and ran the pipes. Then the carpentry students installed the interior walls.

Other classes at the high school visited for practical lessons. Math students came by

to learn how to apply their geometry theories to such everyday problems as how much paint would be needed to cover a room.

When the project began, Habitat was in negotiations for a piece of property just on the other side of the school's baseball field. School officials figured they'd move the house the couple of hundred yards and then build next year's house on the property, an easy walk for the students.

But the land deal fell through, and when the house was finished last year, there was no place for it to go.

No one at Habitat was worried, though. They knew the Shore was rich in land.

One property they were offered wouldn't handle a septic system. Another did, but when they went out to look at it, it was under 6 inches of water, hardly the place to plop a brand new house.

This fall, with a new group of senior building students ready to learn the trade, they moved Townsend's house to the lawn out front and began the second one in back.

The Norfolk Foundation recently changed the terms of one of its grants to Habitat to provide money for land acquisition.

With the money, Habitat went to real-estate agents, and they asked around. There had to be a place to move their house.

The second home is nearing completion, and Habitat still doesn't have a place to put either. The second house is a little narrower and the roof a bit lower. Both changes will make it simpler to move it past

power lines and over tight roads, Downing said.

Margaret Townsend read about the Habitat program in the local newspaper. She and a brother both put in applications for houses, which are sold at cost with no-interest mortgages to homeowners who would not qualify for financing through ordinary channels.

Her brother was chosen by the Habitat Family Selection Committee for one of the homes. His family, too, lived in a house without plumbing.

Margaret's application somehow got lost, she said.

But she was glad her brother got his house first. "He deserved one more," she said. "His kids were younger."

Her house was already being built last March when Margaret got word from Habitat that it would be hers. Both her children attend Northampton High. Her daughter, Neola, had been inside, measuring for her math class, unaware that it would one day be her home.

Margaret went to look as well. She hasn't been inside since they moved it out front, but she has never stopped dreaming and lies in bed planning what she will do with every room.

Nancy Gonzalez, Habitat's executive director on the Shore, said Margaret has been patient. She long ago finished the 350 hours of "sweat equity" that Habitat requires of its homeowners.

Gonzalez said local real-estate sellers have been "unresponsive," so "We'll take anything we can get to."

(AP) - Low mortgage rates beckoned buyers in April and pushed up sales of new homes to the highest level this year and sales of previously owned homes to the fifth best month on record.

The Commerce Department reported that sales of new single-family homes rose by 1.7 percent from March to April to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 1.03 million. That marked the best showing since December.

In a second report, sales of previously owned homes rose by 5.6 percent in April to a rate of 5.84 million, the fifth highest level on record, the National Association of Realtors reported.

Both reports provided fresh evidence that the housing market continues to be one of the economy's few bright spots.

April's performance for sales of both new homes and existing ones surprised economists. They were predicting new-home sales to go down and existing-home sales to rise to a rate of 5.70 million.

The increase in April followed a sizable 8.2 percent rise in March, which had lifted sales to

a rate of 1.01 million. At that time, it marked the best sales level this year. However, April's sales rate of 1.03 million new-homes sold surpassed that.

Low mortgage rates propelled home sales to record levels last year. And this year is shaping up to be the second-best year ever for sales of existing homes and new ones, economists say.

"Interest rates remain low and funds seem to be readily available to creditworthy borrowers," Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan told lawmakers on Capitol Hill. "These factors, along with the ability of households to tap equity accrued in residential properties, should continue to bolster consumer spending and the purchase of new homes."

Some private economists believe the Federal Reserve may opt to cut a key interest rate, now at a 41-year low of 1.25 percent, at its June 24-25 meeting, something that could move mortgage rates even lower.

But other economists believe the Fed will hold rates steady, saying they are low enough to support economic activity.

# Try putting some ceramic tile over vinyl

As with any tile job, the most important step comes next - layout lines. Always start laying tile from the center of the floor and outward toward the edges. Keep it simple by using

premixed mortar and work on one small area at a time. A day of drying is needed before applying grout. After grouting, apply a light vinegar wash; it will make your job shine.

## VW Beetle Convertible: It's great fun!

When the New Beetle hit the American landscape a few years back, it was truly the rebirth of an icon. I think every person in the U.S. can remember the old bug cars of the 1950s and 1960s. And everyone remembers what the familiar engine sounded like going by on the street or on the highway. It was unique, wasn't it?

Well, the New Beetle doesn't sound the same--it's a lot quieter--and no matter what you say to me, I don't think it looks the same. Similar. But not the same.

But it's as cute as the Beetle was so long ago. And small, too. The back seat is almost non-functional. The only people who would be comfy back there are teeny tiny people. My children complained. And begged with me not to consider taking the New Beetle on a weekend trip to Six Flags. I wanted to put it through the paces, but they refused to let me take it with us. As it worked out, they ended up packing the house for a two-night trip and nothing larger than a duffel bag would fit in the trunk.

In all fairness, if you don't have rear seat passengers, you can fold down the rear seat for more trunk space. Then it's not a problem.

Even though the New Beetle is not a novelty on our roads, people still stop and stare. Even in parking lots. The New Beetle I drove was the 2003 model outfitted with a convertible soft top, and a gentleman actually stopped in front of me in the parking lot of the local Sam's Club--in the rain, mind you--to ask me if the soft top was easy to operate. He proceeded to tell me he had an old Beetle in the 60s that was more than a hassle to peel off. Luckily, he didn't ask me to demonstrate how easy it was. But I did verbalize procedure to him and he was truly impressed. I was, too. It rained most of the week, so I had the top down only once, much to the delight of the children.

When it did come down, it did so without a hassle or a second thought. It was simple and easy to do, even without the instructions sitting in front of me. I loved the fact that it was motorized.

The New Beetle can also be ordered with a manual cloth-lined top. One thing that wasn't lost on me was the fact that even with the top on, traffic noise wasn't unbearable, as it is on most convertibles. There are three layers of fabric that provides not only insulation, but also is attractive.

By the way, the semi-automatic power top opens and closes in a mere 13 seconds. When it's open, it rests on the back and can be covered with a boot, which doubles the appearance of the original Beetle convertible. VW thought of everything.

The standard power windows are in sync with the power top and automatically lowers the windows to clear the soft top with the door is opened. When the door closes, it raises the windows to the top, where it seals tight.

Also, there's added safety in Volkswagen's standard Automatic Rollover Support system that provides added overhead security in a rollover accident. There are actually sensors in the car that detect if the New Beetle is in a rollover situation and deploys the supports behind the rear seats. This happens whether the top is up or down. This is a Volkswagen's best feature and exclusive to the New Beetle.

There are a host of trim levels on the convertible to choose from: GL 2.0, GLS 2.0, GLS 1.8, and GLX 1.8 T. As you can imagine, the numeric designation is for the engine size.

Gotta tell you that the engine is more than adequate for a car of this size and it doesn't stop you from being the first one away from a light. Never had a problem merging on the freeway, either.

The New Beetle comes standard with a five-speed manual transmission. Optional is a six-speed automatic transmission with Triptronic. Why in the world would anyone choose the five-speed manual when the Triptronic is available, anyway?

If you don't know, Triptronic allows normal automatic transmission, but allows you to shift manually through the gears through a special shift gate. It's the best of both worlds--use the manual when you want control and the automatic

when you're in heavy traffic and you don't want foot cramps. I think it's a cool option that more and more manufacturers are offering.

Just like its sister sedan, the convertible has front-wheel drive, anti-lock brakes and those pesky daytime running lights. The standard equipment list is nothing to sneeze at and includes steering column, emergency trunk release handle and LATCH for the kids' car seats.

Let me have one more complaint that I don't have a solution to. The front seat belts are an absolute bear to get to. They're far back and you have to stretch way out of position to get them on. Must be 'cuz I'm getting old. It bothered me.

Oh! Another cool feature that's been cropping up on the sport utes but hasn't reached the passenger car market until now is the side mirrors with integrated turn signals. Cool feature that let's other drivers see you more effectively. Although I complained--no, they complained--about the rear seat room, I was pleased as punch to be able to have quite a bit of headroom, hip room and leg room.

Handling? Nimble. I don't think I have to elaborate.

Performance? The best. Ditto on above.

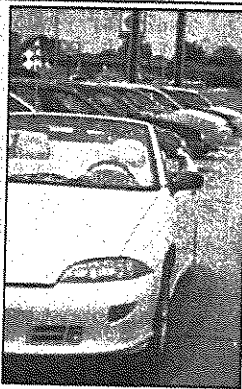
Value? Let me just say German engineering--and a convertible--for just a hair above \$20,000. Nuf said about that, too.
