

Homeowner loses 20 trees

Emerald ash borer costs Canton residents plenty of money

When Rick and Sharon Sovereign moved into their home 4½ years ago, one

of the things they loved about it was the trees.

Located on South Drive east of Lilley, just north of Michigan Avenue, the home was in an existing neighborhood known for its large lots, huge lawns and hun-

dreds of shade trees. The Sovereigns' property was filled with trees.

"All our trees were fine when we moved in," Sharon said this week. "Then last year we noticed we were losing some trees. We took down six last year."

All of the trees they cut down were ash trees, infected by the emerald ash borer. "This year, when spring arrived," she

Ash borer problem branches out

While the ash tree problem keeps growing throughout Canton and southeast Michigan, it appears to be spreading outstate.

Dennis Crimboli, owner of Crimboli's Nursery in Canton, said evidence of the emerald ash borer has now been found as far north as Lapeer.

Tom Korte, owner of Professional Tree Service in Wayne, which services a wide area, said he's been called as far as Portage Lake to remove dead or dying trees.

Korte said many of the calls he receives are from homeowners whose trees have been cut down in the right-of-way by Wayne County, but who are tired of waiting for the county to grind out the stumps.

"Wayne County is dragging their feet on this," he said. "Some people have been told it might be a year before the county gets around to it, and they don't want to wait that long."

Other tree services say their calls about removing ash trees have increased dramatically, while some are reportedly going door-to-door offering to remove the trees, for a fee of course.

Crimboli, whose company will replace trees but does not offer strictly a tree removal service, said he's aware of the door-to-door solicitations. The problem he encounters is when the tree service

Veteran officer bids farewell to active duty



The last time Canton Police Officer Dan Antieau climbed into a patrol car, he was wearing a microphone clipped to his collar to record his activities. The car was fitted with a video camera to accomplish the same thing, an onboard computer to run record checks

from the field and a variety of other high-tech gadgets.

It was a far cry from the old Plymouths that the police shared with the building department when Antieau joined the force in 1976. The "force" was a handful of volunteers who had other jobs during the day and would report

Master plan of Patriot Park is introduced

It's been a long time coming and it's still got a long way to go, but Canton Trustees got their first look last week at a proposed master plan for Patriot Park at Ford and Ridge Roads.

The 120-acre site is bounded by Ford Road on the south, Hanford on the north and extends west from Ridge. Carlisle/Wortman Associates of Ann Arbor was hired by the town-

ship last year to develop the plan after an earlier attempt to create a water park at the site was shot down by complaints from nearby residents.

Canton's Leisure Services Department, in conjunction with Carlisle/Wortman, held a series of meetings with residents to get input as to the types of features and facilities they'd like to see at the location.

Many members of the Northwest

Area roadways are growing more congested

Gary Berry is part of a growing number of Southeastern Michigan commuters increasingly frustrated with congested roadways.

The Dearborn Heights resident commutes daily to his sales job at ABC Warehouse on Ford Road in Canton Township, one of the booming communities in western Wayne County. His travel time has nearly doubled because of a resurfacing project on Ford, and it now takes him about 30 minutes each way.

"My commute is 50 percent longer than it was before the construction began. I've learned to take Cherry Hill Road as an alternative, but even that's getting messed up now that people are learning to take that instead of Ford," said Berry.

Even before the construction, Berry said his commute has progressively gotten longer since he began working at ABC four years ago.

He is not alone. According to a new report by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG), the average drive time to and from work for residents of Southeast Michigan has increased over the last decade, and is likely to get worse as development continues to outpace the population growth.

The regional planning organization, which tracked commuting patterns based on information from the 2000 U.S. Census, found traffic congestion is particularly a problem in Oakland County, where a boom in new jobs has resulted in more vehicles crowding county roadways. According to the report, nearly half of the region's congested roads are in Oakland County, and average commute time for individuals working in the county is about 27 minutes.

average commute time for county residents has increased to about 26 minutes. Of the seven counties surveyed, Wayne County had the largest increase in the number of people commuting outside their county of residence. More than 208,000 county residents now work elsewhere, and more than half of those people are employed in Oakland County.

Wayne County roadways have also become more congested than they were in 1990, according to the report. The county has 185 miles of congested roads, second only to Oakland County, which has more than 300 miles. Roughly 40 percent of the Wayne County commuters polled by SEMCOG said they were dissatisfied with traffic flow in the region.


"The congestion is definitely getting worse in our county, especially in Plymouth and Canton where the residential areas have grown beyond the road system's ability to handle it," said Patrick Hogan, Wayne County's director of roads.

Hogan said the county tries to deal with areas of congestion when they develop by undertaking road widening projects. He said any two-lane road that sees more than 19,000 vehicles per day is automatically put on the list for widening to five lanes. But there is a long waiting list.

Nearly all Wayne County Road's funding comes from state and federal gas taxes, which limits the agency's ability to widen all the roads that are now congested. The agency doesn't have the ability to raise local taxes, and, as a result, can only complete about three projects each year. Hogan said one such road is Warren in Canton, which will be widened in the near future.

PROPERTY EXPENSIVE

Another impediment for the county to widen roads, according to Hogan, is the dramatic rise in real estate costs. To widen a road to five lanes, the county needs 120 feet of right-of-way space, which means property

must be purchased from adjacent landowners.

"The property is just becoming too expensive for us in the places where the need for better roads is most evident," Hogan said.

As a result, the county tries other methods to control traffic, such as installing signals at busy intersections and adjusting the timing of existing signals to make traffic flow better.

The Road Commission for Oakland County, which maintains most of the roadways in Oakland, is in a similar situation. Craig Bryson, the agency's spokesman, said the SEMCOG report only states the obvious.

"The misconception is we build roads, and then the development follows. The reality is we're just starting to catch up with the growth from 20 years ago. We're way behind the growth that is taking place now,"

Bryson said. "The problem is only going to get worse, unfortunately, because all the projections say job growth is going to continue to outpace the population growth. We say to all the drivers that we feel your pain. But unfortunately we have finite means to meet the problem."

According to SEMCOG's Tom Bruff, the next couple of decades will most likely see congestion become more of a problem in the region's rural areas, as more people move to the suburban fringes.

"I don't have a crystal ball in front of me, but our long-range analysis shows congestion will increase in rural areas and roads that are congested now will not be as congested, because of road projects that are and will be taking place," he said.

Bruff said the key to avoiding future traffic congestion in rural areas is

progressive land-use planning. He said local planning commissions should act now before traffic becomes a problem.

"The hope is our report will be used as a tool by local planning commissions to better plan for traffic when making decisions about development. There is no doubt that land use decisions play a significant role in traffic congestion," he said.

Berry said Canton could have used some better planning before the advent of all the development that has taken place in the last decade.


"The infrastructure out here is just the pits. When they set this town up, they didn't do a very good job. This is our Oakland County. I wouldn't come out here if I didn't have to," Berry said.

But longer commutes are also a problem for people living in Wayne County. According to SEMCOG, the

Live grenade forces evacuation of Plymouth City Hall

For the second time in just over eight months, Plymouth City Hall had to be shut down because someone brought a hand grenade inside the building.

City offices were evacuated shortly before 4 p.m. Thursday when a Plymouth Township man walked up to the counter with a box and announced he'd found a hand grenade.

"A construction worker, who was working in Ann Arbor, came upon the grenade and brought it into the police department," said Police Chief Wayne Carroll. "I picked it up and brought it to a secure location outside and evacuated the building."

Carroll said it was a training grenade that still had a live fuse in it.

"It made it explosive," said Carroll. "If it had gone off it would have hurt somebody. It could blow your hand off if you held onto it."

Police cordoned off several blocks around City Hall until a bomb squad from Selfridge Air National Guard Base arrived, put the grenade in a container, and took it to the Bathey property on Mill Street to detonate it.

City streets around City Hall were reopened about 6:45 p.m.


The last time City Hall had to be shut down because someone brought in a hand grenade was on Nov. 5, 2001, during the city commission election. The building was shut down for several hours until Michigan State Police removed the grenade.


Bomb squad unit members from Selfridge Air National Guard Base carry a grenade taken from the front of Plymouth City Hall.



Plymouth Police Officer Chris Lahtinen directs traffic from going down Main St. detouring from City Hall because of a grenade scare.

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
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PROPOSED PARK IN CANTON

Canton Homeowners Association, who were the most vocal opponents to the water park, participated in those discussions.

"It looks to me as if the park as it's being designed is incorporating the kinds of recommendations that came out of those meetings," said Dick Dionne, president of the association. "It will be primarily intended for passive recreational uses, with some low scale kinds of sports."

Nancy Wiggle, another member of

the association, served on the Master Plan Core Group.

"I haven't heard any complaints from the residents about the plan that has been developed," she said last week.

"I like the plan myself because I helped plan it," she said jokingly. "But the township approached this in a marvelous way. From the very get-go we had meetings and invited residents and neighbors and asked what they wanted."

As proposed the plan calls for numerous ponds and bridges, a fishing deck, play structures, a nature center/observatory, an outdoor fountain/ice rink, walking trails, a

splash playground, an in-line skating rink, soccer fields and basketball courts and lots of open space.

The estimated cost of the park as proposed is \$6.7 million dollars.

Ann Conklin, leisure services director, said the plan will be taken back to the board in a month or six weeks after giving trustees some additional information that they requested.

"This doesn't commit us to any construction or development," she said. "It's just a plan. But we can't do anything until the plan is adopted. At the moment we're not in a position to say when any of the construction or development will start."

for duty about 5 or 6 in the afternoon and patrol the streets (mostly gravel roads) of Canton until 11 p.m. when the sheriff's department took over.

"We'd come in and put the overheads on the cars and work until 11," he said. "Then we'd take them off so the DPW and the building department could use the cars in the daytime."

FULL-TIME DEPARTMENT

In 1978, voters approved a millage to establish a full-time police department and Antieau, along with a dozen or so other volunteers, was hired on.

Last week, 25 years later, he retired. He is the first of the "76ers" to put in his 25 years and take the retirement. About seven other originals are still on the force and will soon, or have already, hit the 25-year mark.

But at 50 years old, Antieau isn't completely retiring. While he's giving up his job on the force, he'll continue as director of the Wayne County Regional Police Academy at Schoolcraft's Radcliffe Center, where he has also worked since 1989.

That's when the academy was started and Antieau was offered the position of assistant coordinator. In 1998, when the director was promoted to associate dean of the college, Antieau took over as director, while continuing to work 3 p.m. to midnight as a Canton patrol officer.

And during that time he also managed to finish his degree in business administration from Cleary University. Now he plans to go for his master's.

How did he find time for all of that?

"Well, for three years my wife would say, 'Uh, who are you again?'" he said. "Sleep is overrated. I found out you can actually live on power naps. Twenty minutes at a time will get you right through everything."

It wasn't that way in the early years though. For the first couple of years after the department was started, most residents didn't even know it existed.

"They'd call the sheriff's department or state police," he said. "We weren't getting that many runs, so we had a lot of free time."

They decided to kill some of that free time by seeing how many drunks they could arrest in a month.

"That was back when 18-year-olds could legally drink and there were a lot of bars on Michigan Avenue," he said.

"You could start at Hannan Road on the eastern boundary, stop a drunk, by the time you got to where I-275 is now you'd have another drunk, and before you got to the station on Geddes Road, if you had room in the car, you could make a third stop."

He said they reached a point they were arresting up to 100 drunks a month and they kept it up for several months. And there were only two or three cars on the road in an eight-hour shift.

"It got so busy," he said, "the probation department in 35th District Court had to hire on extra help just to keep track of the probation cases."

The department was operating out of a trailer on Geddes Road and had no cells or holding facilities. When an arrest was made, it was like a scene out of a black comedy.

"We had I-bolts that were welded to a steel post inside the trailer that held the trailer together," he said. "We'd handcuff them to the I-bolts until we had time to transport them to the sheriff's department."

MODERN

When they finally moved into a "real" police station (actually it was the old township hall on Geddes that had been refurbished) they were delighted.

"By that time the floors in the trailer were so rotten that you literally had to watch where you walked. When we moved into the new station we had two male cells and a female holding cell," he said. "We thought we had died and gone to heaven."

And for all those 25 years, Antieau has loved his work.

"You know how some people enjoy going to work," he said. "I actually looked forward to going to work. I've often joked that if I got tired of police work, I'd go out and get a real job. I had fun."

And Public Safety Director John Santomauro said Antieau will be missed.

"He served on a number of special units with special assignments," Santomauro said.

"He's always had a keen interest in development and training. We will view his retirement as missing a valuable asset to the department."

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Frozen drink company breezes into Plymouth

Breeze Freeze, Inc., a frozen specialty drink company that has helped whet slush appetites in Michigan and elsewhere for three years, is about to shift its world headquarters to Plymouth Township.

Currently located on Canton Center Road in Canton, construction for the new facility broke ground off Haggerty Road just north of Plymouth Road on July 1. Located behind Unisys at what will soon be 41303 Concept Drive, the planned 15,000 square foot headquarters will benefit rapid expansion.

"Business is growing so fast now we can't keep up with it," said owner, president and CEO Chester Mazzoni, explaining the need for the new building. "We're actually turning business away. We need more space to be able to fill the demand."

From gas stations, convenience stores and bars to dollar stores, ice arenas and health spas, more than 700 businesses throughout Michigan use Breeze Freeze's services. With 150 served locations in several other states and countries such as the Dominican Republic and Guam, the frozen drink and equipment company even has plans to begin franchising in October.

The new facility will draw together initial warehouses - which currently have to be leased out at two different locations - offices, and a training center where Breeze Freeze employees can learn everything from installing and fixing machines to selling and mixing drinks.

"It's going to allow us probably to increase our business capabilities 10 times," said Sandra Edwards, director of business operations. "We were

on the goal of improving service and providing products that surpassed traditional "sugar and water" mixes in quality.

"The problem that we found in the business that customers weren't satisfied with was service machines and equipment," explained Mazzoni, who previously owned several Coney Islands in the area. "My goal was to give service. Without service we have nothing."

With all-natural drinks made from 32 percent fruit pulp, top selling items include granita bases, ice slushes and smoothies, all in 30 flavors.

Cappuccino, hot chocolate, soups and nachos are among other offerings.

A facility in New Jersey produces the actual 100-percent natural juices, which are then frozen by special machines serviced by Four

Seasons Beverage and Equipment, Breeze Freeze's parent company.

Plans have already taken off in Florida to provide fruit juices and slushes for nursery schools. The company also hopes to soon feature different types of specialty drinks such as Caribbean mixes in bars.

"It's going to give people a taste of paradise that might not be able to go to paradise," explained Mazzoni.

Mazzoni works 12-15 hour days, but says the fun he has makes his work easy. He also anticipates further growth.

"I can see it expanding," said Mazzoni of the new location. He has already told construction workers to "get ready for the next building in 18 months."

The Breeze Freeze World Headquarters is slated to open around Thanksgiving.

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

Headed to the University of Michigan in the fall, Joanna Lin of Canton wants to become an international business leader. And with the help of the Meredith L. Whalen Memorial Scholarship she's making a good start.

"I am definitely honored," Lin said. "I am so glad her mom established the scholarship. It will be so helpful to me."

The scholarship was established by Patricia Whalen in memory of her daughter, Meredith, who died in the World Trade Center Sept. 11, 2001. Meredith worked as a research analyst for Fred Alger Management Inc. and graduated with honors from the University of Michigan in 2000.

Lin, who just graduated from Canton High School, is looking forward to college. She plans to be active in Asia Pacific-American activities, and will study abroad in Taiwan the following year.

"I have a lot of varied interests," Joanna said, adding she would also like to get a law degree.

Joanna is one of 28 Canton and Plymouth residents who were awarded scholarships through the Canton Community Foundation's 2002-2003 Scholarship Program. The program was started in 1990 as a means of helping students in the community.

"We keep adding new scholarships," said Joan Noricks, foundation executive director.

The foundation helps finance some of the scholarships, while others are funded by organizations, companies or individuals. "Some are endowed," Noricks said. "But many are contributed to each year."

The foundation administers the scholarships, accepts applications, reviews them and awards the scholarships and hosts a reception honoring the recipients.

"It is an efficient way for the applicants," Noricks said.

Regardless of which scholarship a student is interested in, or is eligible for, the foundation uses a standard application. The application process includes a 500-word essay.

Lydia Dobson, a recent Salem High School graduate, received the Denski Family Scholarship. The \$1,000, Lydia said, will go a long way in helping her education at the University of Michigan where she plans to study engineering. What kind of engineer she wishes to be is still up in the air. But Lydia is considering mechanical engineering and eventually working in research for an auto company.

"I'm really not interested in the construction of things," Lydia said. "I like testing things."

"The scholarship came a really good time," Wendy said.









In presenting the posters, Robin said, "These people made it possible. We're just the instrument."


Harris said the Family Support group is a year-round operation, but it comes into play particularly when there's a war going on. She said more than 100 volunteers from the community who have nothing to do with the military give their time to the organization because they just want to help. While the group provides a

said, "we had 20 something trees that were dead. We thought what are we going to do?"

Sharon said they called some tree services who came out and examined their trees.

"A couple said they could treat them, but there'd be no guarantee," she said. "We thought why spend the money? They started dying last year."

One tree that was overlapping the road was removed by the county. But the others were all on private property - and the responsibility of the homeowners.

"We had numerous guys knocking at our door unsolicited offering to cut the trees down," she said. "But so many people are wanting these trees cut down, the services are charging an arm and a leg."

Sharon said they had 15 trees in their front yard that were dead, and at \$200 to \$250 a tree to have them removed, it was just too costly.

"We decided to do it ourselves," she said. "So this weekend my husband rented

a cherry picker and spent all weekend cutting them down."

The downed trees completely blocked off access to their front door, so they've been using the garage and the back door for access.

"We're removing all the wood and taking it to a landfill where I suppose they'll burn it," she said. "Then we're going to grind the stumps down and replant with different species. I want to get some pine trees."

Canton Waste Recycling on Van Born Road at Lilley will accept ash wood on Canton Clean-Up Days. Those days are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on scheduled Fridays and 10-11 a.m. on scheduled Saturdays. Residents must bring the wood to the site and present proof of residency.

Sharon is concerned about the impact the ash epidemic is having on senior citizens.

"There are a lot of people who are seniors in our neighborhood," she said. "A lot of our neighbors are getting the trees knocked down for \$250 a piece. A neighbor has 12 or so in his back yard. I think we had the most."

companies grind out the stump.

"They'll grind the stump down eight to 10 inches, but leave the root structure in the soil," he said. "Then the homeowner wants to get a new tree planted in the same spot, but they can't because of the root structure."

He said the new trees have to be planted about five feet or so from the old tree.

"You can take the stump all the way out," he said, "but it's a very expensive cost. You may have to take out some of the root structure and then fill in the area with soil using a backhoe. It's best just to let the stump rot in the soil."

As far as the ash borer is concerned, Crimboli says it's not going away until it can be eradicated.

"This last winter was a pretty bitter one," he said. "I was hoping it might

have killed the emerald ash borer, but that didn't happen."

What did happen, however, according to Crimboli, is that other species of trees were affected by the weather.

"We had a tremendous drought last fall," he said. "Then a long cold winter with no snow. I'm seeing a lot of other dead trees in the area."

He said when the trees "go to bed" for the winter following a drought, and receive little moisture during the winter from snowfall, they're adversely affected.

"We planted a lot of trees in Canton last year," he said. "And we lost some of them just because of that. We lost Japanese maples last winter that were planted 10 years ago - weeping cherry trees that we've never lost."

He said many redbud and dogwood trees also fell victim to the drought and the dry winter.



Twisters sport major talent

They came in all shapes and sizes. Some seemed too big, some too small, some were square pegs trying to fit in the proverbial round holes.

But at the end of the day, they were all just football players. And in that respect, they couldn't be closer if they tried.

That's the story of the Michigan Twisters, a minor league football team that draws many of its players from the Observerland area.

From the outside, they are a mixed bag of players from greatly varied backgrounds. Some wear jerseys as T-shirts, others wear T-shirts as jerseys. But from within, it's just a group of fun guys who get together to enjoy the sport they have returned to after a varied number of years away from the game.

"We're out here, just doing what we

love to do," said 1999 Wayne Memorial graduate Craig Curry, a defensive back for the Twisters. "There's no pressure, just a good bunch of guys who love the game."

The Twisters, who relocated from Sandusky, Ohio, seven years ago, moved up to the Mid-Continental Football League (MCFL) for the 2003 season, which is a playing level higher than they saw in 2002, while members of the Lakeshore Football League (LSFL).

In that 2002 campaign, the Twisters regularly blew teams out in the regular season, when scores in the 50s weren't uncommon. But the move up, to a "AAA" level of play, is a welcome one according to the team's president and CEO, Glenn Brothers, a Canton resident.

"We feel like we're ready for this new

competition level," Brothers said while observing a recent practice at Inkster's Cherry Hill Middle School. "Now we're in a league with three national champions, but that's all right. This team has a ton of talent and I'm anxious to see how we stack up."

"The players pushed for Glenn to move us up a level," Curry said. "We were getting tired of playing those cupcake teams."

The Twisters have their roots in Ohio, when the team was known as the Sandusky Sea Raiders of the LSFL. Brothers relocated to Ohio with his family through his job with Ford Motor Company. While there, his son Aaron became a standout linebacker at Huron High School, and was recruited by Penn State, among other Division I programs.

Aaron Brothers spent a year playing for coach Gerry Faust at the University

On Thursday in Kalamazoo, the Kingdom ruled, edging the Bucks 1-0 at the Mayor's Riverfront Stadium.


The loss left the Bucks at 13-3-1. Kalamazoo is 8-7-2.

of Akron before transferring to Central Michigan University. While he was sitting out his one year after transferring, Brothers caught on with the Sea Raiders.

Through his son's involvement with the team, Glenn Brothers became a part of the Sea Raiders' organization. He started out as the special teams coach and later filled in as the team's general manager. A career move back to Dearborn prompted Brothers to take the team with him, renaming it the Michigan Twisters.


The Twisters play their home games at Willow Run's Devlin Stadium and Rynearson Stadium on the campus of Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti. The team is also a nonprofit organization, with all the proceeds from home games going right back into the team for uniforms, equipment and better video hardware.

Much of the off-the-field work is done by Brothers himself, as well as the players.

Brothers' wife Loretta bought road white jerseys for the team, while Glenn keeps track of all the game statistics as well as making the numbers work financially for the franchise. The players pound the pavement, selling advertising on their own in area communities. They get a bonus if they reach certain sales goals, and can choose to have their extra ad sales added to another player's total if someone else is lagging behind.

"I try to give them everything they need," Brothers said. "Most everything I've gotten in life has been a direct result of someone helping me out. So now this is my chance to help out other people and give them a break if I can."

"Something like this, it builds a lot of friendships and helps keep these kids out of trouble when they reach that

after-high school stage of their lives."

For the players, the team provides them an opportunity to continue playing the game they loved as kids, and participated in as high school students, sometimes beyond.

Unlike many other sports, there aren't many natural organizations to move to if a player wants to keep playing football but doesn't play at the college level. This team provides an opportunity to those players, who want to either continue their playing career, or become reacquainted with the game they've grown to love.

"I didn't even play for four or five years after I got out of high school," said Matt Koskie, a 1997 graduate of Redford Thurston. "A friend of mine told me about the team, and this is the one I felt most com-

fortable with. There's a lot of team unity here and everyone really seems to bond with one another."

Koskie, a resident of Garden City, was an all-conference player with the Eagles and team captain in 1996. He says seeing the game from the perspective of someone older makes him appreciate his time with this team much more.

"Maybe some guys didn't go all out in high school, and this is their chance to play the game to their fullest and have fun doing it," he said. "The competition level is very intense, and it's unreal how good some of these guys are that we play against, both here in practice and in the games."

That talent level should increase with the Twisters' arrival to the MCFL. One of the team's first opponents, the Detroit Seminoles, has eight

players who have experience with Arena Football League teams. The Seminoles were also named the 2002 AAA National Champs.

Over the past three seasons, the Twisters have ripped up the competition, going 28-4 in the LSFL. The team won the LSFL championship in 2002, capping a three-year run that saw it win three straight Northern Division titles.

The Twisters added three straight wins over "AAA" level teams (same as the league they are playing in this year) to win the 2002 Mi-States Tournament Championship. Their all-around success was rewarded when Minor League Football News magazine named the Twisters as the 2002 AA National Champions.

"These guys are winners, every damn one of them,"

Brothers said, while sporting a stopwatch and whistle around his neck at practice. "We've had consistency with our coaching and our talent is multi-faceted."

An example of that multi-faceted talent was on display at a recent practice. The team's regular starting quarterback, Orlando Wright, had to work late, so backup Jeremy Overton was taking the snaps.

That in itself isn't unusual. What is however, was Overton's position on the field when he played at Wayne a few years ago. He was an offensive and defensive lineman, positions that fit his 6-foot-3, 255-pound frame. But watching Overton take a few snaps, it became obvious he's as comfortable behind the line of scrimmage as he is playing on it.

A left-hander with good

mobility, Overton, 22, smoothly ran several option plays in one series of drills. On the next, he showed nice zip and accuracy on his throws.

"He's not as proficient at the position as Orlando is, but he's got one of the best arms I've seen," Brothers said.

Overton personifies the "square-peg, round-hole" makeup of the team. Players who settled into one position, played and possibly excelled in those positions in high school, find themselves in new places now.

Another example is 22-year-old Frank Stanford. The 5-10, 175-pound wide receiver quarterbacked Walled Lake Western to the 1996 Class AA state championship. But now he finds himself in the dual role of wide receiver and defensive back for the Twisters.

The players' ages range from the recently graduated (19-year-old Otis Smith, Jr. from Robichaud) to the not-so-recently graduated (49-year-old Gerald Hughes of Ecorse). Observerland area players include: Curry and Overton (Wayne Memorial), Jason Black and Ben Ferguson (Garden City), Koskie (Thurston), Surili Kelly-Powell (Catholic Central), John Irvine and Robert Pensari (Livonia-Churchill) and Mark Bennetts (Westland John Glenn).

"I just have a passion for the game and love playing it," Curry said. "In high school, you'd feel all this pressure to be perfect. It's not like that here. We're just out here now to have fun and compete. Being on this team, you get to know some great personalities through the other guys."

The Twisters opened their 2003 schedule Saturday night with a home game against the Lorain County (Ohio) Steelmen.

SECTION A. PURPOSE.

- Section 2a.** This section provides for violations of §§168.1 to 168.992 applicable to petitions; and penalties.
- Section 3.** This section provides for incorporation procedures; submission of proposition to electors; time; petitions; and verification of signatures.
- Section 3a.** This section provides for notice to clerk of township not incorporated as charter township; and procedures relative to resolution of township board; notice of right to referendum; petition; signatures; submitting question of incorporation at general or special election; and wording of ballot.
- Section 4.** This section provides for procedure relative to nomination of candidates for township office; conducting primary election; duties of township clerk; and duties and composition of board of township election commissioners.
- Section 5.** This section provides for procedures relative to the make-up of township board; election of members; powers and duties; supervisor as presiding and executive officer; authentication of instruments; president pro tem; clerk; record of proceedings; and temporary clerk.
- Section 6.** This section provides for authorized payment of trustee by charter township board and compensation for expenses of members.
- Section 6a.** This section provides for an ordinance establishing procedure for determining salary of elected official; contents; conducting business at public meeting; public notice; resolution implementing ordinance; petition for referendum; change of procedure; and decreasing salary of elected township official.
- Section 7.** This section provides for procedure relative to township board; meetings; conducting business at public meeting; notice of meeting; transacting business at special meeting; quorum; adjournment; rules and order of business; journal; voting; availability of certain writings to public; attendance and conduct at meetings; misconduct in office; and duties of sergeant-at-arms.
- Section 8.** This section provides for procedures relative to the charter township board and monthly publication of proceedings, notices and ordinances.
- Section 9.** This section provides for the powers and duties of Township officers, including additional officers and limitations.
- Section 10.** This section provides for appointment of the Township superintendent and the delegation of powers and duties of township supervisor.
- Section 11.** This section provides for the tenure and qualifications of the Township superintendent, and waiver of residency requirements.
- Section 11a.** This section provides for the appointment, powers, duties and compensation of Township assessors.
- Section 12.** This section provides for the establishment of a Township police force, a township marshal, the appointment of the same and the township board's authority to make rules concerning the governance, powers and duties of the police force.
- Section 13.** This section provides for the establishment of the township fire department, the township fire chief, the rules, and the township board's authority to make regulations and regulations for the governance of the same and the regulations and penalties of refusal to aid at fire.
- Section 14.** This section provides for the charter township's power to acquire property and approval of electors.
- Section 14a.** This section provides for bonds for public

improvements, the issuance of bonds, approval required; exceptions; limitation of net indebtedness, computation of net indebtedness; bonds subject to provisions.

- Section 15.** This section provides for authority to enact ordinances to provide for peace, health and safety; licenses, granting, fees, bonds.
- Section 16.** This section provides for streets, alleys, bridges, and public places; regulation of use; record of ordinances, filing.
- Section 17.** This section provides for the construction of buildings; powers and liabilities of charter townships as to public health and safety.
- Section 18.** This section provides for the authority for the charter township to join with other governmental unit or agency.
- Section 19.** This section provides for ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations of former township; and continuation.
- Section 20.** This section provides for legislation to be by ordinance or resolution; form, passage, amendment, recording, authentication, and compilation of ordinance.
- Section 21.** This section provides for violation of ordinances; sanctions; designation as civil infraction; act or omission constituting crime; penalties and distribution of fines.
- Section 21a.** This section provides for police officers; right to pursue, arrest, and right to detain person outside of charter township limits.
- Section 21b.** This section provides for police officer or constable and authority to execute bench warrant.
- Section 21c.** This section provides for regulation of recreational trailways; posting of ordinance; violation as municipal civil infraction; and penalty.
- Section 22.** This section provides for regulations concerning ordinance publication; effective date; publication of summary or true copy; catch lines required; and drafting of summary.
- Section 23.** This section provides for a relationship to and adoption of state law or standard code; publication, distribution, charge.
- Section 24.** This section provides for the submission of itemized estimates of anticipated expenditures; preparation and submission of budget proposal; and time.
- Section 25.** This section provides for procedures relative to a budget proposal; contents; and commencement of fiscal year.
- Section 26.** This section provides for a public hearing on the budget; notice, prior public inspection.
- Section 27.** This section provides for the adoption of a budget by township board; resolution; appropriation; tax levy; limitation; separate appropriation for fire and police departments; tax collection; interim budget.
- Section 28.** This section provides for restrictions concerning expenditures outside of the budget or supplemental appropriations; expenditures, restrictions; unencumbered balances, transfer, reappropriation.
- Section 29.** This section provides for procedure relative to quarterly statement of estimated and actual income and expenses; submission by supervisor to township board; reduction of appropriations; and exceptions.
- Section 30.** This section provides for annual audit of accounts, results, filing, public inspection; and annual report of township business.
- Section 31.** This section provides for local or public improvements; determination of necessity; special assessment; duties of officers; and bonds.
- Section 32.** This section provides for succession to properties of former township; suites or prosecutions; debts and liabilities; uncollected taxes and assessments.
- Section 33.** This section provides for the liberal construction of this ordinance.
- Section 34.** This section provides for the exemption of the charter township from annexation to contiguous city or village; exceptions.

SECTION B. VIOLATION AND PENALTY.

This section provides that any person or entity that violates any provision of this Ordinance may, upon conviction, be fined not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or imprisoned not more than Ninety (90) days, or both, in the discretion of the court.

SECTION C. REPEAL.

This section provides that all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

SECTION D. SEVERABILITY.

This section provides that any unenforceable section can be severed from the rest of the Ordinance.

SECTION E. SAVINGS CLAUSE.

This section provides that adoption of this Ordinance does not affect proceedings, prosecutions for violation of law, penalties and matured rights and duties in effect before the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION F. PUBLICATION.

This section provides that the Clerk for the Charter Township of Plymouth shall cause this Ordinance to be published in the manner required by law.

SECTION G. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This section provides that this Ordinance, as amended, shall take full force and effect upon publication as required by law. 

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

My 3 1/2-year-old, who has never had a children's party of her own yet, told me she wants a "fashion" birthday party when she turns 4 in the fall.


"Sure, honey," I said, though I wasn't really sure what she meant by a "fashion" party. I figured she would change her mind half a dozen times anyway. But when she began telling everyone that she's going to have this "fashion" party, I knew I had to ascertain what she had in mind. I finally figured out that she means a costume party. So after getting through seven birthday parties in recent weeks, and with my youngest already dreaming of her October fashion party, I have little energy or desire to whoop it up on my own birthday. Besides, I don't want to get any older. So there.

Markets continue in heart of suburbia



Ahh, summer.

Long days, warm nights, and the only time to get fresh Michigan corn so good, so sweet, that it practically melts in your mouth.

And at Canton's two farm markets, Mary's and Costantino's, the golden ears arrive fresh from the fields several times each day, all summer long.

"People come here for the sweet corn," said Mary Hawk-Valdivia of Mary's Farm Market on the corner of Ford and Beck Roads. "That's what we're known for."

But people drive out to Mary's for the locally grown tomatoes, too, and the peppers and the cucumbers. They come for the melons and the squash, and in the fall, of course, the pumpkins.


This year, said Hawk-Valdivia, the corn is about two weeks late due to a cold, wet spring. It will first arrive at the market in mid-July.

In addition to the produce she grows at her own farm, Hawk-Valdivia also stocks a wide variety of fresh fruit and vegetables from other area farmers.

During the summer months customers find her shelves loaded with fresh cherries, peaches, lettuce, potatoes and other produce in season.

"The flavor of Michigan products is so much different from the stuff that gets shipped in from out of state," said Hawk-Valdivia. "There's nothing better than the flavor of fruits and vegetables that were picked that morning."

Hawk-Valdivia now farms the same land her grandparents bought in 1919 to escape the post-war

sprawl of Garden City. Her parents later continued the tradition, running the farm with help from their six adopted children, including Mary. She recalls spending many summers in the fields with her parents and siblings.

"We grew up together, we went to church together and we worked together," she said. "My parents have always been very big on family values."

With her father now in semiretirement, Hawk-Valdivia looks back on fond memories that made

farming a way of life, rather than a job, for her. "I always loved being outside working with my dad," she said, "and I always strived to make him proud. As a daughter I felt I had to work harder than my brothers to prove myself."

Hawk-Valdivia was driving a tractor by age 8, spraying and cultivating the fields at 12 and growing her own crops for personal profit when she was 14.

"My parents were very supportive of all of us

when we wanted to do something," she said. "They never pressured us into farming. If we didn't want to farm, we didn't have to."

But she wanted to farm, and the long family tradition continues, these days with her own three kids: Mary, 16; Andrew 14 and Rachel, 13. Even the fourth, Dominic, 1, hangs out at the market with mom when the corn starts coming in.

"I depend on my kids,"

Village Painters' memory boxes bring comfort to grieving parents

Hand-painted decorative boxes of all shapes and sizes fill the couch in Mary Ann Snodgrass' Garden City home.

They're just a sampling of the work done by the Village Painters, a group of decorative painting enthusiasts.

"If it stands still, we'll paint it," Snodgrass said. "Tin, wood, papier mache, boxes, you name it."

The boxes, close to 30 in all, were ready for delivery to Providence and Riverside hos-

pitals. They're memory boxes that will be given to parents who lose their babies at birth or prematurely.

"They're so they can put in their baby's birth certificate, a blanket they had it wrapped in," Snodgrass said. "Everybody does their own designs or we do a paint-in. We meet at someone's home and have someone teach us a design."

According to Snodgrass, the Village Painters started making the boxes two years ago, after member Diane Bert of Birmingham saw a short piece about the Memory Box

Program in *Tolé* magazine.

The group decided to contact hospitals locally after finding out that to participate in the national program meant going through the magazine, which translated into the expense of shipping the boxes back and forth.

Snodgrass estimates that the group has done close to 250 boxes, while nationally more than 50,000 memory boxes have been donated since the program was founded by Tera Leigh four years ago.

Providence gives out 10-12 of the boxes each month, while

Riverside distributes 6-10 boxes a month, she added. Memory boxes with cute teddy bears on the lid can take


about four hours, while the more elaborate lace-topped

she said. "We're a family business and they're up every morning for sweet corn."
 At Costantino's Farm Market, Ernie and Chris Costantino continue to run the farm their parents established back in the time of the one-room schoolhouse.
 Like Hauk-Valdivia, they bring fresh produce from the fields several times a day.
 "A couple hours after you pick the corn the sugar starts turning to starch," said Richard Costantino, brother of Ernie and Chris. "That makes the corn more chewy. The fresher you can get it, the better it is. That's why we pick it every day."
 The Costantinos also sell U-pick peppers and tomatoes in season, although the demand isn't quite what it used to be.
 "We don't see too many canners any more," said Costantino. "We used to get people coming in to place orders for 30 or 40 bushels of tomatoes and peppers. We still get a few like that, but not many."
 Still, he said, many of the same customers have been driving the extra miles to his family's farm for years, looking for a taste of fresh produce not found in any grocery store.

Once a thriving farm community, Canton has changed in many ways over the last few decades.
 "The farmers started getting old," he said, "and the kids didn't want to take over the farms. Many of them sold the property for development."

Even though most of Canton's farms have been squeezed out, some things haven't changed at all.
 "My mother's still out at the farm," said Costantino. "You can always catch her out on the front porch or in the

garage talking to someone while she cleans tomatoes. We're not going anywhere."
 Costantino's Farm market is located in Canton on Cherry Hill Rd., between Beck and Denton, and is open for business from mid-July to mid-September.





boxes can take up to 10 hours, she said.
 "When you do it at home, it depends on the amount of time you have," said Margaret Pedersen of Livonia. "You have things that keep interrupting you."
 "Some days, it depends on the time you have to give to it," added Karen Capshaw of Canton.
 Peterson, Capshaw and Nancy Spradlin of Novi were at Snodgrass' home for an afternoon of painting and chatting as they worked on memory boxes.
 "The hospitals tell us they're so greatly received, the parents are glad to have them,"

Snodgrass said. "They go home with empty arms, but this way, at least they can take home their memories."
 The Village Painters group meets the first Thursday of even months except December at the Senior Center on Farmington Road, south of Plymouth Road, in Livonia. It attracts decorative painters from throughout the metropolitan area.
 Members usually take the boxes home and bring them back when finished. Sometimes, they'll paint a box they have at home and donate it.
 "We have our meetings every other month and that's when they pick up the boxes," Snodgrass said. "They bring them back at the next meeting. Some members take two, three

boxes to work on."
 "I think for me, it shows I'm thankful for my four healthy grandchildren," Pedersen said.
 "And the parents really do appreciate them," added Capshaw, president of the Village Painters. "We get a lot of good remarks back from the hospital."
 The foursome gets together quite often to paint. They use words like method painting and teachable art to describe it. Spradlin should know. "I don't have an artistic bone in my body," she said.
 Capshaw has a studio in the basement of her home where she teaches four classes a week. She teaches everyone from beginners to advanced decorative painters in all mediums and attracts students by word-of-mouth and open houses three times a year.
 "The hardest part of painting is hiding all the junk you brought home from your husband," Pedersen said.

A prime source of the tools they use is the Society of Decorative Painters, to which the Village Painters belong. The society has 27,000 members from around the world.
 Pedersen has been painting for 32 years, starting with ceramics. Snodgrass hadn't painted for a long time when she took up decorative painting because she wanted to work in acrylics. Capshaw has been at it for 20 years and, like Snodgrass, took a break before resuming her painting.
 "It's our relaxation," Pedersen said. "We have a good time. It's cheaper form of therapy, that's what people say."
 And what they're doing on quiet afternoons together also is appreciated. "It's a way of handing back to somebody," Capshaw said.

A splash of water safety can't hurt summer fun

Summer fun in Michigan includes many outdoor activities, especially splashing around at the pool or lake. While making sure your kids are protected from the scorching sun and drinking enough water to stay hydrated on these hot days, staying safe in the water is cool, too.

So what exactly can you do to stay safe in and around the water? "No. 1 is to take swim lessons," said Julie Sommers, Community Safety and Aquatics manager for the American Red Cross. "Learning to swim helps you stay safe and have fun in the water ... for kids and adults."

Liz Groth, director of the swimming program at LifeTime Fitness in Novi, agrees. "I encourage kids and parents to embrace the water, not to be afraid of it. Learning water safety and knowing how to swim helps you have fun," she said. Her philosophy is not just to teach the kids to swim to the other side of the pool, but if they fall in unexpectedly, she wants them to know how to turn around and swim back. "I want the kids to know what to do if they are in deep water, and not to panic," said Groth.

WATCHFUL EYE

Sommers advises swimming in a supervised area with lifeguards, but not all pools or lakes have certified attendants. "If you are in an area where there are no lifeguards, know your kids' swimming skills and abilities and be sure to keep an eye on them. Never leave a child unobserved around the water," she said.

Groth added that getting into a conversation with a friend or answering a cell phone call can mean you are taking your attention off your kids. It may seem like common sense, but it only takes those few minutes for accidents to happen, she said.



Also making kids aware of pool rules and knowing where water safety equipment is located can save a life. "Kids also need to know what to do if someone else is having trouble in the water, whether it is another child, or adult," said Groth. "It is important for kids to learn to throw a rescue device and call for help."

If you have a pool in your home, or you have a place on the lake, have life-saving equipment available. "Rescue equipment should be easily accessible to anyone," said Sommers. "Basic lifesaving equipment such as a rope, pole and personal floatation devices should always be kept around your pool or swimming area."

If you don't have a phone near your pool at home, you may want to think about installing one.

"Having a phone nearby is recommended so you can call 9-1-1 in an emergency," said Sommers.

For boating safety, kids need life jackets. The life jacket should properly fit for the age and size of the child. Make sure it is secured properly and fits snugly, but not too tightly, said Sommers. Avoid life jackets that are too big.

Groth recommended Coast Guard-approved life jackets that have the pillow behind the head. "The pillow on the back of the life jacket helps support the head and keeps them from flipping over onto their stomach when they are in the water," she said. The Coast Guard seal of

approval is located on the inside of the vest, also noting weight limit recommendations. These life jackets can be found at sporting goods stores, said Sommers.

It is not recommended to substitute other floatation devices such as rafts, inflatable toys, rings or water wings as safety devices. These inflatables should not take the place of a life jacket because they can get punctured and deflate.

"Kids can also get caught underneath an inflatable toy and go under the water silently. They can't yell for help, or be heard," said Groth. Be careful around pool slides also. Be aware that the undercurrent at the bottom of the slide can take kids under water quickly.

KNOW POOL RULES

Sommers recommends that parents educate themselves and their kids about the facility they are using. Know pool or beach rules and follow them. She also encourages parents or caregivers to take a class in first aid and CPR.

For pool owners, the American Red Cross offers a 20-minute video called *Home Pool Safety: It Only Takes a Minute*, which helps families learn how to enjoy their home pools safely. For additional open water safety information, a 30-minute video called *Water: A Deceptive Power* is offered, which educates about realistic situations that

teach skills assessment, high-risk water activities safety and injury prevention in natural waters, Sommers added.

The American Red Cross swimming classes, community water safety classes and first aid and CPR programs are offered at your local community recreation centers, YMCAs, and other wellness and recreation facilities. To learn more about the American Red Cross Health and Safety Services, log on to www.redcross.org. For more aquatics program offerings, call your local city parks and recreation department, or visit www.ymcadenetroit.org or www.lifetimefitness.com, to find programs and locations near you.

Here's a quick review of water safety for the pool or lake:

- Learn to swim
- Never leave a child unobserved - maintain constant supervision
- Install a phone by the pool
- Enclose your home pool with a self-closing fence
- Don't leave furniture or toys near pool fence or lake - kids can climb over and slip in
- Keep rescue equipment readily accessible, and teach kids how to use it
- Avoid using inflatable toys as safety floatation
- Use Coast Guard-approved life jackets with head pillow
- Learn Red Cross first aid and cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- Post CPR instructions and your local emergency number by pool
- Follow pool and beach rules
- Be sure docks are in good condition - no loose boards or exposed nails
- Know depth of the water and kids' swimming abilities
- Look before jumping off dock and never let kids swim under dock or raft

Practice a water safety drill with your family so kids know what to do.



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
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
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

Pointe at Treyborne Cove offers 2nd floor option

Whether you like one-floor or two-floor condominiums, there may be one for you near Haggerty and Maple in Commerce Township. The Pointe at Treyborne Cove condominium development is on Crumm Road, one block north of Maple, west of Haggerty, minutes from the M-5 Connector.

It's surrounded by green and adjoins a 22-acre wetland. The Pointe, as well as a nearby development of single-family homes, is the work of the Ivanhoe-Huntley Companies. Sidewalks aren't planned as part of the rural-looking development.

Three types of condos are offered - make that six types. Each of the three basic plans can have a second floor, if the buyer desires.

Condominiums range in size from 1,580 to 2,145 square feet, and in price from \$237,000 to \$298,000.

The grand opening is scheduled for mid-September, although the development is open now.

"These are the only condominiums under \$300,000 within miles," said Gary Shapiro, Ivanhoe-Huntley co-part-

ner. "With every home having its master bedroom on the first floor, we expect the condominiums to appeal to young professionals, active seniors and empty nesters."

Buyers who choose to add a second floor gain another bedroom, bath and loft area with walk-in closet.

"We expect that many people will want to use the second-floor area as an office or an area for visitors to sleep," Shapiro said.

Two models are going up now, but 10 of the 48 units already have been sold, said Kris Gosselin, sales and marketing director.

Condominiums will be laid out with just four units in each building. The architect designed four versions of each building, showing what a building might look like, depending on what buyers want.

While some apartments and condominium units allow sound to travel through common walls, condos at The Pointe will fight this two ways. Each unit has no other above or below it, so sound from another owner can't travel up or down.

The other way Ivanhoe-Huntley will keep the units quiet is by using Nu-

Wool insulation in the walls. The insulation not only reduces the heat flow but also deadens any sound from adjoining units.

Each unit has an attached garage. Standard amenities include air conditioning, vinyl insulated windows and exterior wood deck. Standard flooring includes carpet and vinyl flooring, with a choice of ceramic tile or hardwood in the foyer and powder room.

Brick with vinyl siding are primary exterior materials.

Addington, 1,580 square feet, is the smallest of the three first-floor plans. It has a master bedroom with bay window, great room with optional skylights, dining room, kitchen with nook area, first-floor laundry, library and attached two-car garage.

If you add a second floor, the Addington becomes the Addington II with 1,981 square feet of space.

The next largest first-floor, the Barclay, features two bedrooms and two baths, a great room with fireplace, dining room with bay windows, kitchen, nook and laundry room.

Carlington is the largest of the three first-floor plans. It has a master bedroom with bay windows and cathedral

ceiling. The master bedroom adjoins a bath with walk-in closet. Off the kitchen is a nook/sitting area and first-floor laundry room, which links the home with the two-car attached garage.





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Communities reborn a year after Arizona wildfire

Rows of gleaming white and pastel mobile homes line the streets of the Pinecrest Lake RV Resort, standing out against a backdrop of countless blackened trees.

A short distance away, power drills whine. Hammers pound.

These are the sounds of

a community's rebirth. A year ago, one of the West's largest wildfires tore through this area of Overgaard, Ariz., charring 469,000 acres, including mammoth swaths of pine-covered mountains, while overrunning rural subdivisions.

In all, 491 structures were destroyed. The largest group of burned buildings was in Pinecrest

Lake, which lost 168 homes - most in the mobile park. The trees that backed the property were torched, leaving behind only charred trunks, some bearing a few denuded branches.

"Everything was just melted down to nothing," said Mary Jane Wagner, 68, whose home was reduced to a foot-high heap of debris.

Today, she has a new mobile home. The flower bed next to her driveway, planted before the flames swept through, has come back on its own - a bright collection of purple, pink and red blooms.

The couple also planted a maple sapling. "We will have trees again. It won't be the tall ponderosas, but we'll have trees," said her husband, Les Wagner, 74.

The fire began in two parts on June 18 and June 20 on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation south of this eastern Arizona community.

Authorities say the first fire was started by part-time firefighter Leonard Gregg so he could make \$8 an hour in his seasonal job with a Bureau of Indian Affairs fire crew. He faces trial on federal charges.

The second fire was started by Valinda Jo Elliott, a Phoenix woman who was trying to get the attention of a television news helicopter after being lost in the wilderness for two days.

The wildfires eventually merged on June 23. As they advanced, about 30,000 people were evacuated from homes in Show Low, which serves as the region's commercial hub in eastern Arizona, and Heber-Overgaard and surrounding communities. Residents lived in fear and uncertainty for days.

Frustration mounted as the evacuations dragged on - in some cases for up to two weeks.

"It was a very bizarre sort of thing. It just grew and grew," said Heber-Overgaard Fire Chief Mell Epps. "It was like it was self-propelled. You could hardly stop it.

You couldn't slow it down."

A massive firefighting effort eventually saved Show Low and other communities. Subdivisions west of Show Low were devastated.

But construction here and in neighboring communities has been steady since then, with many crews reporting six to eight months of work lined up, said David Ashton, director of Navajo County's development services.

Families without insurance or without enough insurance have been able to get some help from private donations.

Jim Burton, a Heber real estate agent who oversees a committee distributing fire recovery funds, said about \$210,000 was donated, and much of the money has been allocated to uninsured residents who lost their primary homes.

Ashton said many of those who were underinsured are turning to mobile homes rather than conventional construction to get a new start. Businesses are also rebounding.

"Things are actually doing pretty well," said Ronna Lea Martinson, who owns several retail businesses in the brightly painted western-themed

storefronts in Overgaard's Bison Ranch.

Thirty-eight of the log cabin-style homes in the development were burned, but most are being rebuilt, said Martinson, whose husband, Gary, is the Bison Ranch developer.

Pinecrest Lake resident Beverly Fraser, 71, said there were plenty of reasons to rebuild, even with the loss of so many of the pine trees that originally attracted people here.

"We still owned the lot. The same nice people are here. We have the climate and the nice clean air," she said. "We still had four out of five things. . . We just lost the trees."

Elizabeth Baer, 32, a cashier at the Overgaard Market, said most people who can afford to rebuild are doing so, and the community has mostly returned to normal.

But even so, the memories of the fire linger.

After two long weeks of evacuation and fear her home would be burned down, the prolonged tones of the emergency broadcast system alert still trouble her, said Baer.

"The test sound on the television puts a shiver through me to this day. I feel silly, but it does," she said. "It was just so horrible."

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Developers to replace golf course with Wal-Mart, homes

A group of investors plan to build a Wal-Mart Supercenter and homes on the site of the President Broadwater Golf Course in Biloxi.

Carlton & Associates of Baton Rouge, La., and A.D. Jaldan Enterprises, a company owned by Gulfport hotel owners Daniel and Julia Chang, will buy the golf course in a deal set to close in October, said Michael Cavanaugh, an attorney involved in the sale. Terms of the deal were not disclosed.

Cavanaugh said the sale is contingent on a review of engineering, zoning and permitting issues.

The 18-hole, 198-acre golf course is on prime West Biloxi real estate, between Pass Road and

U.S. 90. The Harrison County Tax Assessor's Office said the course has a value of about \$1.9 million.

"It's a beautiful piece of property that will be enhanced and improved to the point of becoming a showcase for commercial-residential development in Biloxi," Carlton & Associates' Tommy Vervacke said in a statement.

The golf course will remain open until late this year, said Joe Giardina, a president spokesman, and the 25 people who work there will be offered other jobs in the President Casino or hotel.

At the end of the year, construction on 90 acres of commercial development, anchored by Wal-Mart, will begin, officials said. Houses will come later.

The development will retain the Broadwater name, Cavanaugh said.

"Broadwater is associated with premier projects and entities and the new owners want to continue to do things to enhance

the name," he said. The President's financial problems forced the casino to sell the course.

Two weeks ago, the hotel and golf course emerged from Chapter 11 bankruptcy, after signing a \$43 million loan. President Casinos Inc., the casino's parent company, is still in Chapter 11.

The sale of the course allows the casino to eliminate 30 percent of its debt, Giardina said.

At the time of the hotel's bankruptcy filing in April 2001, the resort owed \$40.3 million to creditors.

Craig Adams, the President's general manager, and Giardina said the sale will not hurt the casino, and will give it a stronger financial foundation.

"Golf courses are not a primary piece of our business," Giardina said.

"The Palace Casino, Casino Magic Biloxi, Imperial Palace, they don't have golf courses. We'll still offer golf packages, but they'll be playing on other courses."



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

2003 Mazda Truck makes great strides

The new 2003 Mazda Truck has been vastly improved over the past two years, and there are many revisions this model year. With three models to choose from -- regular cab, two-door extended Cab Plus and four-door Cab Plus 4 -- you'll find diversity in your choices.

Be advised, however. The Cab Plus models have fold down jump seats that only the under-teen and petite will be able to fit back there. I tried to climb in the back, and actually did get back there, only to find the person who would be opposite me on the other side would have no leg room. It's also quite the job to get back there as an adult.

My two skinny figure-skating children complained about the jump seats, but dealt with them. The major complaint was when my 11-year old sat down on the seat in shorts on a hot summer day. "OUCH!" she screamed because the seats were so hot. That's vinyl for you.

But basically, that's the only major complaint I had with this spirited truck. There are three trim levels to choose from, including Base, Dual Sport and 4x4. The model driven this week was the Cab Plus 4x4.

On the outside, the Mazda Truck looks a bit aggressive, especially with its distinctive grille and hood deflector. Lines flow around the vehicle, lending itself to a softer look on the sides and rear treatment. I can visualize a gentleman in the truck easy enough, but I can also see a lady choosing this truck for its looks.

Also on the outside is a black cap added to the front bumper. Two tow hooks are located in the lower air dam and are discreetly and stylishly hidden. There are also three trim levels to choose from: Base, dual Sport and 4x4 models.

Three engines are available to choose from on the Mazda Truck, including a 2.3-liter four-cylinder that gives you 143 horsepower, a 3.0-liter six-cylinder that

nets you 154 horsepower and the top contender is a 4.0-liter dual overhead cam six-cylinder that's one of the most powerful in the industry with 207 horsepower.

That's the engine that was in the 4x4 model tested this week. It was more than adequate for everyday driving on the highways and byways of Metro Detroit. It never disappointed me while merging on the freeway. This engine is also mated to a five-speed automatic transmission. With its towing capacity of nearly 5,900 pounds, it can easily tow a snowmobile trailer or camper for your trips up north.

The 4x4 driven had 16-inch wheels and a four-wheel-drive system that's a snap to use and provides surefire traction in any situation, whether on- or off-road. It has a high ground clearance and the tubular (read that really classy-looking) running boards help get you in and out of the truck with ease.

All 4x4 models also have styled steel, AM/FM/CD stereo, air conditioning, cloth seats and carpeted floor mats as standard equipment. Every Truck model offered by Mazda comes with four-wheel anti-lock brakes, sliding rear window, anti-theft immobilizer, spare tire lock and dual airbags. One feature my girls really liked was the passenger-side deactivation switch, which let me turn the airbag off so I could give them a

treat with a ride in the front seat. It's standard, too.

In the inside rear view mirror are a compass and outside temperature gauge, a feature I have grown to truly enjoy. We were idling outside a store for about 15 minutes while someone did an errand and were surprised to look up at the temp indicator and it read 107 degrees. It was only about 85 degrees out there, however. On the subsequent ride to our next destination, it fell in increments of 3 to 5 degrees to the proper temperature. You'll be pleased to know that Mazda Truck comes with 24-hour roadside assistance and that Mazda dealers will give you a loaner when your truck is being serviced. You'll also get a full tank of gas when you pick up your new truck. That's what it's all about, isn't it? The little stuff.


I also enjoyed the great gas mileage it got -- 15 mpg in the city and 19 mpg on the highway. And the price? Under \$27,000 out the door. Base price of the Truck is \$22,900.

The Mazda Truck packed a few surprises, like its versatility, economy and price. On my wish list is a real rear seat on the extended cab. It was a week of fun driving the Truck and a real pleasure to tool around in. Go check one out.
