Real-life bounty hunter has apprehended nearly 1,000 fugitives

Kelly Cresswell used to dream of becoming a police

As a teenager, he subscribed to a slew of law enforcement magazines and would pore over them while working third shift as a security guard at an apartment complex.

"And then one night, I saw an advertisement for becoming a bounty hunter in the back of one of the magazines," he said. "Now, I don't even hunt anymore because once you hunt a human, there's nothing like it."

Cresswell, who grew up in Westland and goes by the nickname "Decaf," became a bounty hunter just before his 18th birthday in 1998 and says he has apprehended nearly 1,000 people since then.

His job takes him all over the country, including New York, California and Virginia.

And unlike the bounty hunting situations shown on television, Cresswell, 27, rarely kicks

## Woman accused of murdering child to stand trial

Carol Poole, the Canton woman accused of intentionally causing the death of her 2-year-old foster daughter, will stand trial Jan. 7.

Poole, 42, has been charged with felony murder, first-degree child abuse and involuntary manslaughter in the September 2006 death of Allison Newman.

On Tuesday, Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Ulysses W. Boykin failed to make an immediate ruling on defense attorney Mark Satawa's request to suppress statements that Poole made to Canton police in the hours after the child was rushed to the hospital.

Satawa previously called in a forensic psychologist who testified that Poole was so emotionally distraught at the time of the questioning that she was unable to give a voluntary statement.

"She was under such enormous strain that she really didn't know what she was saying," Satawa said.

Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor Jerry Dorsey IV countered that Poole, who is being held in Wayne County Jail, was able to gather her

Dorsey said repeatedly in court Tuesday.

During the proceedings, Boykin is expected to issue Poole's eyes filled with tears as she glanced at her husband, Alan, and at one point, she buried her face in her hands and sobbed.

While Satawa and Dorsey waited for Boykin to set a trial date, Allison's paternal grandfather, Kenneth Newman, rested his head on nis knees and cried

On Monday, Boykin rescheduled the hearing to Tuesday because Newman and Satawa got into a confrontation outside the court-

"Sometimes emotions run high but this is a court of law," Boykin said.



## Board, consultant to meet to set search blueprint

Plymouth-Canton Schools trustees have tentatively scheduled a Tuesday night workshop to set the agenda for a superintendent search with Roger Garvelink, a senior consultant for Hazard, Young, Attea & Associates of Glenview, Ill., the firm selected by the board Monday night on a 6-1 vote to conduct a national search to replace Jim Ryan, who will retire in February.


"This is one of the most difficult decisions I've had to make since I've been on the board," said board Secretary Steven Sneideman. "I do believe we need a national search, and they'll do a better job. Hazard is one of the best at the national search, from what I can gain from all of this."

Trustees interviewed two search firms last week, including Michigan Leadership Institute of Old Mission, Mich., which was the choice of Barry Simescu, the lone vote in favor of MLI.

"I was on the fence until I talked to the president of the Utica Board of Education," Simescu said of his reference check concerning MLI. "They got two excellent candidates from out-of-state. As for dollars and cents, I think we would get just as good a job from the MLI proposal, and it's less money."

MLI's price for an all-inclusive search was \$17,500. HYA's bid was for \$20,000, with additional charges for advertising and plus consultant and candidate expenses which could increase the cost to \$33,000.

We owe it to the community to do it the right way, and not look at the dollars as much as putting together a quality process so we'll be able to attract someone," said board President Judy Mardigian. "I can't see us running all the aspects of a search as an elected board; which would include the community engagement pieces and really finding out what the community is looking for, and then doing all the logistical pieces to it. I think it would send a message (to super-

intendent candidates) this board micromanages."

Garvelink said one of the first steps in the search will be to determine what various groups are looking for in a new superinten-

"We'll meet with board members, community groups, faculty and administrative staff to get input and ask questions about their attributes of the district, to help us sell the position and attract candidates we would like," Garvelink said. "It will also help us as consultants when we interview potential candidates as to what kind of challenges they will be facing."

Garvelink, who was Birmingham superintendent from 1978-1990 and is consulting in the current Birmingham superintendent

search, said his knowledge of Plymouth-Canton will help him in the search

"I can speak with real conviction, I've watched the Plymouth-Canton district grow over the years and I can hopefully give a genuine sales pitch," he said. "Because of the bad publicity Michigan has gotten the past couple of years because of our financial situation, we found in the search for Birmingham that was a deterrent in finding national candidates. But, I try to turn it into a positive, it's a wonderful time to come to Michigan and buy a home. Michigan still has a lot to offer."

Jim Ryan usually sits quietly on the sidelines as the Board of Education discusses its plan to replace him as Plymouth-Canton Schools superintendent when he retires in February.



"I'm a little melancholy about said he told the board. "They said 'We can do it,' and I think they have."


Ryan was appointed superintendent in December 2002.





## 'Sad scenario'

#### District calls for action after Senate slashes funding

Sad is the word Wayne-Westland school board President Skip Monit used to describe the budget crisis that has state government facing a partial shutdown.

"It's a sad scenario and it's getting sadder all the time," he

His comments came Monday evening as Wayne-Westland school officials once again urged residents to let lawmakers know they need to "fix the budget problem, fix it right and fix it now.

The call came just 24 hours after the state Senate, along party lines, approved two budget bills that would cut almost \$1 billion in expenses, including millions of dollars in funding for school programs.

"I urge all residents, even those not affiliated with schools but who want to see the state survive, to contact lawmakers and tell them there needs to be cuts, there needs to elimination of all funding for be restructuring, there needs to be new revenue," Supt. Greg Baracy said.

School board trustees joined Baracy in urging residents to express their displeasure with the budget stalemate.

Trustee Terrance McClain quoted the late Martin Luther King Jr., telling people that "The only thing that allows evil to triumph is good men doing nothing.

"Our children are our most precious thing," he said. "We have to make our legislators understand that the children are our priority."

"Call them, e-mail them, bombard them with letters. Let them know we need the money," Trustee Steve Becher added. "If we want the state to prosper, our students have to prosper."

"It's been very difficult and we have worked diligently to have the best program we can," board Secretary Martha Pitsenbarger said. "I encourage anyone involved in any way with our schools to contact our legislators."

The bills passed Sunday evening in the Senate include a \$43 million cut to Michigan's colleges and universities and

middle school math grants and declining enrollment funds. They also reduce at-risk funding by \$28 million as well as provide no increase in the per-pupil state school aid pay-

ments. According to Gary Martin, deputy superintendent of administrative and business services, the district could lose "a chunk" of the \$3.9 million in at-risk money it receives, not to mention the \$100,000 budgeted for the math grant and a small amount for declining enrollment, but the biggest bite might come with a flat perpupil foundation allowance.

The district had anticipated a \$100 per pupil increase when it passed the 2007-08 budget in June. If there is no increase, it would mean a \$1.4 million revenue shortfall.

The district already is using \$5.5 million of its fund equity to cover a revenue shortfall. Martin doesn't think the support will be there to increase that amount to almost \$7 mil-

lion. Drastic cuts would be up to the board, he said.

"That's the worst case. We've heard everything from \$1.5 billion in cuts to cutting no cuts," he said. "A lot depends on the income tax rate or the sales tax and that's difficult to tell with what's going on. We're not sure where it's at right now."

State Sen. Glenn Anderson. whose 6th District includes a large portion of the Wayne-Westland school district, opposed the two budget bills, saying: "These are not 'solutions.' They will only push Michigan further down the road to crisis."

"The results of these cuts would be tragic to Michigan, threatening education, health and public safety," Anderson said in a statement released Monday. "If Michigan is going to be a place where people want to do business and raise their children, we must invest in education. These cuts are short-sighted."

## **Board approves** increase in general fund to pay for roads

In adopting the proposed Dec. 1, 2007 millage rates Tuesday night, Canton officials have agreed to shoulder even more responsibility for improving some stretches of countyowned roads within the township. The board unanimously voted for the decrease of the police special assessment millage by 0.25 mills and the subsequent increase of the charter millage by 0.25 mills.

The increase to the general fund, which is expected to generate nearly \$1 million in 2008, will be used solely to pay for road improvements, including the rehabilitation of Sheldon from Palmer to Cherry Hill.

Referencing a surplus, Public Safety Director John R. Santomauro supported the millage decrease for the police department.

Township Treasurer Elaine Kirchgatter said the decision to increase the charter millage makes sense because Wayne County is unable to fund all of Canton's road projects.

"(We) were elected to make tough decisions and this is a tough decision," she said. "I feel this is the right thing to do."

Other rehabilitation proiects that the township would like to pay for out of the fund include Lilley from Palmer to Cherry Hill. Warren from Beck to Canton Center and Morton Taylor from Warren to Joy.

The township board, which also approved the 2008 budget on Tuesday, must vote to set aside the money for road improvements annually.



## Car salesman threatened after fraudulent carjacking

An employee of a Michigan Avenue car dealership reported last week that a man who recently bought a vehicle from him has threatened him.

The salesman, 36, told police that a 28-year-old had come into his dealership with a group of friends recently and made a car purchase. Shortly afterward, the purchaser reported to Detroit police that he had been carjacked.

She said no and then he forced himself onto her.

The girl said she hadn't told her story before because she was afraid she would get in trouble for dating the boy. She told police she knows very little about the boy and that the girl who introduced her to him now lives in Illinois.

Canton Police contacted the girl's father and he arrived a short while later to speak with his daughter.

A registered sex offender avoided making contact with Canton Police on Sept. 18 because he "didn't want to go to jail."

In the first year, teachers get step increases plus a quarterpercent lump sum raise, which won't be added to the contract pay scale.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education approved the contract Tuesday night.

The top scale of teachers, who don't receive a step increase, will receive a 1.5-percent lump-sum pay increase. The second year of Tiffany L. Parks the contract, in 2008-09, gives

annual step increases to teachers, with those at the top of the scale — who don't get a step increase - getting a 2-percent raise.

Entry-level teachers with a bachelor's degree currently start at \$39,954, with the top end of the scale \$66,388 after 10 years. Teachers with master's degrees start at \$43,954 and after 11 years top out at

"This is a market change for us," Portelli said. "We have not turned our backs on the district for the financial problems it has. Our members get a twoyear agreement that freezes health care costs and saves them money. It's good for the district because it also saves them money over the two-year period, reducing their costs in health care."

Portelli and Supt. Jim Ryan

said the district will receive bigger discounts in health care costs as all teachers will be enrolled in one Blue Cross Blue Shield plan, instead of the previous three choices of health

"We're going to save from \$400,000-\$500,000 in health insurance costs," Ryan said-

"That says the teachers union was reasonable in their negotiations, and understood the economics of our situation."

Ryan said another detail of the contract includes closing schools for the November 2008 election. Teachers and parents had expressed concerns in the past because the school buildings are used for voting, but because of space there is sometimes no separation of those walking into the buildings and students.



Canton resident Charles Blue, Jr., 38, plead guilty Tuesday to charges of criminal sexual conduct first degree and assault with intent to murder his ex-girlfriend. Under his plea agreement, Blue, Jr., will serve a minimum of 15 years and up to 25 years in prison. Third Circuit Court Judge Patricia Frescard accepted the plea





## Rep. McCotter gets airtime on BBC broadcast

As a congressman, Thaddeus McCotter is accustomed to answering reporters' questions. Things were a bit different this past week, however, when the Republican from Livonia was interviewed by the British Broadcasting Corp. on Fred Thompson's run for the presidency and other GOP hopefuls.

The BBC story, heard by local listeners on satellite radio, focused on the presidential hopefuls who were in Michigan for the Republican Mackinac Leadership Conference. McCotter introduced Thompson, a former U.S. senator.

"I'm supporting Fred Thompson," the congressman said Tuesday. "I think he's a proven, common sense conservative. When you've got all the presidential candidates hanging around, you never know who's going to pop up," he added of the BBC reporter.

McCotter has been interviewed by the BBC in the past on the Iraq situation. He noted his Irish grandfather would have laughed "the BBC talking to me."

The congressman listens to radio broadcasts on his iPod, but hasn't heard a lot about the BBC story. "I don't know

what people listen to. There are so many options out there. You can find out anything you want if you look hard enough."

McCotter noted of the BBC: "It's government-run. It's like the CBC." Questions have been raised in the United Kingdom about the BBC's objectivity, he said, but "not being British, I don't have an opinion on it."

He was approached by the BBC after introducing Thompson, who also has an acting background. "I don't think I was their first choice,' McCotter said.

He's interested in how British people view our politics and vice versa, noting our government is based on Britain's going all the way back to the Magna Carta in

"We're traditional allies." he said. "We like to keep an eye on the British. The War of 1812 isn't that far away.'


When leveraged with existing federal grants, the total amount to be spent by Wayne County on this effort will be more than \$405,000.





## **Property owners** have right to hunt

Drive along one of the main thoroughfares in Canton, and you will have a tough time finding remnants of the township's rural agricultural past. But if you drive along some of the back roads on the township's western'side, you can still catch a glimpse of that past. There are still a few farms here and there, and plenty of woodlots scattered about.

Now that the 2007 hunting season has begun, hunters will take to the field in some of those wooded areas, which township officials aren't too happy about. Earlier this year, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources once again denied Canton's request to ban hunting in the township. Instead, there are now closed areas (everything east of Canton Center) and restricted areas.

Township officials, particularly in the police department, believe this is a safety issue. With the growth of the township's population in recent years, they think it is only a matter of time before there is some kind of accident, more specifically a hunter shooting someone.

The reality is there are typically few hunting accidents, particularly since the state mandated that new hunters take safety courses. In 2006, there were only 36 hunting accidents reported to the DNR's law enforcement division. Of those, only four incidents resulted in fatalities. And in many of the incidents, hunters injured themselves because they carelessly handled a firearm or because they stumbled

While any accident should be lamented, these numbers indicate that hunting accidents are not very common, especially considering there are nearly a million hunters taking to the field each year. There is a better chance to be killed in an automobile accident than getting shot by a hunter.

Still, Canton officials are right to be concerned — that's their job. But property owners have a right in this state to hunt — as long as they are not hunting within 150 yards of an occupied dwelling, which is state law. This is something the DNR has affirmed time and again.

The fact is many people moved to Canton because they wanted to live in "the country." Subdivisions have been built next to wooded areas where families have been hunting for years. If you live next to one of these wooded areas, be cognizant that it is hunting season and someone might be hunting there. That means make sure you or your children are not trespassing on someone else's property, which is illegal.

Hunters also need to be cognizant that this isn't the Canton of the past, and there are new subdivisions and more people around. Before shooting, you need to not only confirm your target, but also what is beyond your target. These are basic rules that all responsible hunters live by anyway, but they are more important in suburban areas.

If everyone simply follows these rules, Canton police officers won't have to deal with any hunting incidents.

### Short jabs help state in economic slugfest

Michigan's been hit with a one-two punch with the pullout of area corporate headquarters, like Volkswagen of America in Auburn Hills and Comerica. The state may be bloodied; however, it's not down for the count.

In fact, what is less known are the many success stories in the area of economic development in southeastern Michigan. That's is an important story that not only needs telling but promoting.

Success, as the saying goes, breeds success. Just as some out of state companies may be reluctant to locate here, hearing about the growing number of firms making a move to Michigan ought to tell CEOs that Michigan has a lot going for it.

How the state's economic image is portrayed needs to be revised to target a new audience. Forget the corporate office buildings; what's happening here is the growth of smaller, sometimes high tech businesses.

And the Michigan Economic Development Corporation has played a key role in this upswing.

Recently, the MEDC announced nine new projects that received state help to create nearly 3,000 jobs. There's more. Also included in the projects is roughly \$52.3 million in new capital investment in communities, including three tech companies in the Ann Arbor.

In a separate announcement, a British company has said it is establishing three firms in Troy to deal with different segments of the amphibious vehicle market. One of the firms is expected to bring 1,500 jobs to the area.

As good as all this is, what may be equally important is the determination seen at Oakland County's Automation Alley, also in Troy, to fight back.

Six companies are joining Automation Alley's trade mission to India Oct. 10-20. While many companies are outsourcing work to India and elsewhere, those on the trade mission expect that country's growth to produce a demand for products and services that Michigan can

Automation Alley isn't just seeing stars with that goal. A Warren company reportedly got a \$100,000 manufacturing contract on a pre-mission trip to India.



## Prison reform, worker benefits key parts of budget woes

fter another week of watching the same endless shenanigans going on in Lansing, I can only repeat: "Michigan's political, policy and finance systems are broken. Ten million Michigan citizens have been held hostage to the partisan agendas of both political parties and their members who now hold office, not to mention the interest groups that fund their campaigns."



We are in trouble. We're facing the greatest crisis since the Great Depression, and desperately need leaders with a vision for Michigan that will get us through our present turmoil and lay the foundation for a radical transformation of our state.

We're not going to get that by habitual partisan finger pointing or by absurd, face-saving compromises that claim to "solve" the \$1.8 billion state budget deficit. Without a new vision, no matter what they do, a similar deficit will be staring us in the face next year.

Even if we buy into that vision, it won't become reality unless we have state government that is effective, efficient and

Republican lawmakers say the way to do that is by cutting something like \$1 billion from state spending. But you when ask exactly what they'd cut, mostly what you get back is mumbles about "government waste, inefficiency and bloat." That's not a responsible recipe for crafting a budget. Especially when they've known the dimensions of the problem we're facing for a

But if they are serious about cutting spending, here are two big, obvious, long-overdue ways to cut nearly \$800 million, as suggested in The Center for Michigan's most recent newsletter:

First, enact \$500 million worth of prison reforms. Michigan's incarceration rate is 40 percent higher than our neighboring states, while our crime rate is just about the same. One-third of our enormous state prison population is there for drug-related or nonviolent crimes. Nearly another third are being held beyond their earliest possible release date. And our prisons cost Michigan taxpayers around \$5,000 more per inmate each year more than neighboring states pay to keep theirs locked up.

Ending expensive jail time for nonviolent offenders and releasing inmates unlikely to be dangerous to society will save hundreds of millions. Gradually bringing pay for Michigan prison guards in line with neighboring states would help. Privatizing some operations like food service could save even

People from all over the political spectrum — business conservatives, social liberals, academics and the state's financial advisers — have for years urged cost-conscious prison reform.

Any concrete results? Nah. In part, Republicans fear being accused of being "soft on crime." ■ Second: Bring Michigan state worker benefit costs in line

with the national average. How big? Around \$275 million. Both the Small Business Association and The Center for Michigan reached that conclusion in separate studies earlier this year. Republicans are going to have a harder time swallowing the

first of these two suggestions; Democrats, the second — but both are vitally necessary. For a while earlier this summer, both Gov. Jennifer Granholm and Democratic lawmakers talked a good game about reforms in pay and benefits for state employees earlier. But not recently. The story in Lansing is that public

employee labor leaders are holding court in the capital, holding the line against reforms among the troops who want labor campaign contributions later on.

Detroit News columnist Daniel Howes, in a stinging column last Saturday, asked of labor leaders: "Tell us how you explain to recently retired autoworkers fearing for their pension and health benefits that they have to pay higher taxes so their pals in the public sector won't be asked to do the same? Answer: You can't, and sooner or later they'll wake up to the rank hypocrisy and fight back."

And although much of the debate on the revenue side of the budget argument has had to do with the income tax, here's a quick, simple and fair way to bring in an added \$300 million each year:

Tax beverages.

States like Texas and California raise more than \$100 million each year by taxing unhealthy, sugar-saturated soft drinks; they're classified as "food" in Michigan and therefore not taxed.

Our tax on beer was last adjusted 41 years ago ... when it was cut to just under two cents per beer. Two cents in 1966, adjusted for inflation, would be about 14 cents a bottle today. All lawmakers would have to do to raise \$225 million would

be to raise beer taxes to keep up with inflation. But they haven't. Why not? Because the beer and wine lobby is among the most powerful in Lansing. And lots of legislators are scared they'd anger off blue collar beer drinkers. So, instead, they're arguing about an income tax increase that would cost a \$50,000-a-year blue collar worker another \$275. That would buy an awful lot of beer.

There you have it; three simple ideas to make our government more efficient and less costly. There are lots of others: Benchmarking public employee pension and health care benefits against public employees elsewhere or (gasp!) private sector workers. Find ways vastly to increase collaboration and service sharing among Michigan's thousands of local government units and school districts.

And if government is indeed to be more accountable and effective, we need more experienced, strategic, competent and decisive leaders - leaders who are willing to set aside traditional party politics to find common ground strategies to move Michigan forward.

Why has this been so hard? Mainly for two reasons: First, the law we passed setting strict and short term limits makes sure that we will be ruled by lawmakers who are relatively inexperienced. Second, the way we redraw legislative district boundaries assures that candidates at each political extreme are mostly the ones elected.

The ideas I'm proposing here are neither new nor particularly complicated. They're common sense ways of finding common ground that most of Michigan's 10 million citizens can agree on.

So how do we get people talking about making common sense the centerpiece of our political discussions? That will be the subject of community conversations taking place throughout Michigan next month as part of the Michigan's Defining Moment campaign.



## Welcome back to wonderful world of reading real books

he kids at Birmingham Berkshire Middle School are engaged in a novel — and I do mean novel — program. They're reading. They are reading things they can hold in their hands, and I don't mean iPods.

For 15 minutes a day, the kids just sit and read. They can read novels, magazines or anything they want except text-

I just don't think I have the stamina anymore to wade through Trollop's Barchester Towers, and I refuse to have anything more to do with the vastly overrated Jane Austen. On the other hand, I think a moratorium should be put on Stephen King — one book every five years.


For the past few years, I have been concentrating on local history books, which is a fascinating area in itself. Everybody should at least thumb through Silas Farmer's mammoth History of Detroit and Michigan. What makes this book really amazing is that it is probably still is the best history ever written in Detroit — and it came out in

Farmer did some other local history books, as did Clarence Burton, who is probably best known for founding the Burton Historical Collection at the Detroit Public Library. Friend Palmer also did some 19th century contemporary history books that are worth a look. But the number of local history books isn't endless and I'm back to poking around the shelves of the new novels.

I just finished J.M. Coetzee's Foe, which was fairly dumb, Paulo Coehlo's The Alchemist, which was OK, and am into See, by Jose Saramango, which -100 pages in so far - is enticing, although a bit of a challenge considering there are no paragraphs or quote marks and the sentences tend to run on and on — which, while it can be an effective style, makes for some disjointed reading despite being fairly and surprisingly comprehensible when you finally get to the end and reflect back on what you have just read like a rider on a charging steed. Get the idea?

At any rate, it's good to be back into the world of novels. Reading them has been an experience of a lifetime — literally. I hope the kids at Berkshire pick up the habit. There is a whole world of great, and some not so great, books waiting

No one, including me, likes to see their investments go down. However, that's the reality of the stock market. Successful investors recognize that volatility is part of the process. A well-balanced, diversified portfolio can somewhat reduce the impact of short-term volatility. Don't focus on the day-to-day volatilities of the stock market, but rather on the overall portfolio strategy. Make sure your investments match your goals and objectives and that your portfolio is diversified and

As we are entering the last quarter of the year, there are some strategies that investors may wish to consider. The first is whether to convert a traditional IRA or a portion of it into a Roth IRA.

The transaction must be completed before Dec. 31. Many brokerage houses and mutual fund companies require at least a few weeks to complete the transaction. If you are considering conversion, don't wait.

I am a fan of converting to Roth IRAs because it allows the individual investor to turn tax-deferred money into tax-free

The longer you have until you need your money from your IRA, the greater the benefit of converting.

In order to convert, you must have an adjustable gross income of \$100,000 or less. If you meet this criterion you are

eligible. If you are over 701/2, you cannot convert your required minimum distribution, however, you can convert anything above and beyond that amount.

My general rules are: 1) you have the money to pay the tax created by the conversion, without touching the money converted; 2) converting the money will not throw you into a higher tax bracket; 3) you can let the money grow within the Roth IRA for generally at least five to

Yes, you are incurring a tax liability by converting. However, the long-term benefits of a Roth IRA are substantial. The money you are converting would always have been subject to tax.

By converting, you're just paying that tax earlier.

It's also time for year-end tax planning. Whether it's selling investments to recognize tax losses or accelerating deductions into 2007, the goal is to focus on your increasing net worth. Don't do anything for tax reasons alone. Do tax planning that will result in you having more money in your pocket — exactly where it belongs.





## Realtors heed safety needs on the job

BY JULIE BROWN STAFF WRITER

Oakland County Sheriff Michael Bouchard doesn't see a lot of problems with Realtor safety in his area. Even so, he agrees Realtors - and all

professionals - need to think about safety on the job.

"Absolutely. Those would be a good starting point," Bouchard said of National Association of Realtors advice to keep a charged cell phone handy at all times, and meet potential clients for the first time at the office. He recommends letting colleagues know the hours you'll be away, and your general schedule.

'If you're uncomfortable, there's always security in numbers," Bouchard said. A Realtor can ask a friend to accompany him or her for an open house.

"Occasionally, you'll find individuals that pick certain m.o.s, what we call methods of operation," he said.

One sex offender he

recalled concentrated on getting women alone. "It's something you

have to be knowledgeable of, aware of and take steps to prevent," Bouchard said. Wayne County

Sheriff Warren Evans agreed real estate pros need to consider safety concerns. "I think most of them are savvy on their


own," Evans said of real estate pros, noting they deal with all kinds of "I think their instincts are better

than the average person," Evans said. He agreed it's best to have a person come into the office prior to a first "Preventative medicine's always the

best," said Evans, noting it's not good to be alone with strangers until you've determined it's safe.

For Realtors and other real estate professionals, it's an everyday occurrence to meet clients for the first time. Every job that requires interaction with the public involves some risk, which is why the NAR is reaching out to its 1.3 million members as part of its fifth annual Realtor Safety

According to the U.S. Department of Labor in its most recent Survey of Workplace Violence Prevention, 2.5 percent of real estate businesses reported an incident of workplace violence in 2005. Although not com-



mon, real estate professionals across the country have been assaulted, robbed, even killed in the course of doing their jobs.

Given their dedication to helping families achieve their dreams of homeownership, Realtors believe that their profession's rewards far outweigh the risks," said NAR President Pat V. Combs of Grand Rapids, Mich., and vice president of Coldwell Banker-AJS-Schmidt. "NAR's ongoing commitment to Realtor safety education and awareness helps our members minimize those risks and, in the process, protect their customers and clients, as well. It's one more way Realtors add value to the real estate transaction.'

In advance of Realtor Safety Week, NAR distributed an education and awareness kit to all of its more than 1,400 local and state associations, as well as the top 500 brokerages across the country. The Realtor Safety Week Kit includes a video, which has been revised and updated for 2007; support materials for safety presentations and awareness outreach; and a wallet-size card of safety tips, such

own car for showings. Wayne County's Evans agreed: "Try to go in separate cars. It's not good to be at the whim of a client."

He recommends getting a license plate number, and leaving that with colleagues back at the office before going out to show a property. Oakland County's Bouchard agreed

it's key not to advertise property as

vacant. Potential clients should be known as much as possible to the Realtor, to avoid dangerous situa-"You should take steps to make

sure you're not alone in a bad situation." Bouchard said. "We try to put protocols in place." He's seen crimes in which car salespeople have been carjacked on the job.

It's a good idea for a Realtor to have a "code word" he or she can use with family or associates if in trouble, Bouchard agreed. You can ask an associate to check in with you regularly while out on the job "and have a duress code if something is not right.'

"Realtors are busy, it wouldn't be an unusual thing for the phone to ring," Bouchard said. Evans noted such a code word in a phone call is useful "so that the person standing there doesn't have any idea you're calling for help."

The annual awareness week, held Sept. 9-15, is just one of many ways NAR helps Realtors recognize potential threats and protect themselves throughout their careers. This year for the first time, NAR is offering a scenario-based 3D online safety course through REALTOR University at www.REALTOR. org/RealtorUniversity. Q. What do you think of the advisability of a professional director and/or a board member being paid?

Nonprofit Corporation are incorporated in their Articles of Incorporation. I believe that all directors should be educated and I find, with interest, that the California legislature has been considering SB 948, a bill that would require board members of community associations to complete education coursework. If signed into law, the bill would require every member of the board of directors of an association to take a course on statutory and case law relating to community associations not less than every two years. That would also allow the association to pay or reimburse the coowner \$25 for course fees, \$100 for travel expenses. Maybe that's a good idea for Michigan.

Q. Our management company has instructed our attorney to send a Notice of Intent to File a Lien letter well before a lien is placed on the unit. What has been your experience with this practice?

A. Our experiences representing hundreds of associations over the years has been that while it is sometimes effective, generally speaking sending a Notice of Intent to record a lien is a waste of legal fees which the association may have to incur. We recommend an aggressive and consistent collection policy which results in a lien being placed on a unit for nonpayment of assessments as soon as reasonable notice of the delinquency has been given by the association or its managing agent to the delinquent co owner that the matter is being turned over to legal counsel. This protects the association by placing a lien in the public record earlier and in these difficult economic times, it increases the likelihood of a successful collection for the association at reduced legal fees.

## TOO COMPETENT? REDIRECTING CO-WORKERS



Mildred L.

A highachiever may unintentionally inspire laziness and lack of follow-through among coworkers. John Twomey,

president of the National Workforce Association in Albany, N.Y., almost wryly characterizes such co-workers as "withdrawing, relying on a champion and being pretty successful at not being willing to step up.

It's a classic stand-off: The more you step in to do, the less your co-workers offer to do. While you may be thinking about how to change their behavior, consider, too, how to change your own.

'RUTS'

"Ruts get established over time, creating a great deal of inertia," observes Todd Dewett, associate professor of Management in the Department of Management at Wright State University in Dayton, Ohio. If you have difficulty understanding why coworkers might not want to change, consider the insights of consultant Steven Feinberg of Steven Feinberg Inc., in Palo Alto. "They have a comfort zone," he states. "That's part of it. They stick within what they believe they can tolerate. They try to be consistent with the image they have of themselves so they're consistent in their behavior. We're motivated to be who we think we are.'

The same may be applied to the person who's so competent that it's easier to continue jumping in to save projects when others fall back. Being that competent is comfortable. But being that competent

doesn't always work, particularly when there is too much for one person to do. **BREAKING THROUGH** DYSFUNCTION

What can you do? Twomey says that

options include: - bringing in an outside facilitator:

- "walking away in disgust;" convincing the team to become part of

the change; or

"accepting the situation." Feinberg offers different perspective developing influence among the group's leaders. "Go to the trusted people leads and get them on board first by doing some new things," he recommends. Give them evidence to support the need to adapt.'

Dewett advocates "informal persuasion" and accountability for change on both sides. "Take your part of the blame so it's not all about pointing fingers," he directs. "Frame it in terms of how(BEGIN ITAL)we(END ITAL) can do this better. Be positive. Don't assume that they understand exactly what you're talking about and don't forget to mention the skills you're working on. Open up the discussion.

"Let people know they can change," he continues. "This should be part of the standard, consistent communication. Identify and recognize those who are (changing) to send the correct signals."

Then what? You don't want people to backslide. Lee Miller, co-founder of Your Career Doctors in Morristown, N.J., maintains that you must determine whether fear of success under the new rules feeds their reluctance or whether experience teaches them that you'll revert to your practiced method of being too competent.

Do you make them look successful when

you're the one who truly is? "If you want the change to stick," Miller advises you to incorporate "resolve, support and fear":

Make certain that they understand that you won't continue to pick up the slack, that the change is permanent;

Get them to buy into the belief that the team and the organization will increase its success this way; and

- Communicate that this is it -- be fullyfunctioning contributors or become marginalized.

Then, you must keep your side of the bargain. Do not continue to pick up the

slack. Prepare to marginalize yourself. If you find yourself backsliding, go to the team's top influencers and remind them that you don't support backsliding - even your own - and want their help in adjusting your own behavioral patterns. You don't want to make yourself obsolete, which is exactly what will happen as everyone else starts stepping up to the plate. When they do, your job description

Garden City, RU and Redford Thurston simply are not in the business of turning prep athletics into an extension of pro and college, as seems to be the case elsewhere.



## VOLVO HAS A 'HOT HATCH' IN NEW C30

With high gasoline prices now firmly established as a fact of life, automakers are devoting more attention and resources to small cars. As a result, they're finally bringing some meaningful diversity to a category that was stuck in a bland homogeneity for many years.

Volvo's brand-new C30 sporty compact is in the very vanguard of this development. Aiming to appeal to young urbanites and compete with established lookers including the Volkswagen GTI and the Mini Cooper, Volvo has launched the C30 this year behind hot styling, peppy performance, and just enough amenities to make it a credible entry in the high-end small-car derby - what some wag has taken to calling the "hot hatch" segment.

Aiming the car mainly at the narrow streets and tight parking of the European market, Volvo also has graced the United States with the C30, a sporty hatchback that closely follows the design of a concept vehicle from a few years ago. Starting retail prices are around \$22,700, but fully loaded, C30 can set you back around \$30,000.

For that kind of lucre, you want something that impresses - and C30 delivers. Start with looks: C30 boasts a tongue-wagger of a design, both in the overall and in some intriguing details. Not known until lately for its design prowess, Volvo really has pulled out all the stops with the C30. Its dramatic wedge shape and short-clipped rear end suggests a vehicle back on its haunches, ready to rocket.

The chopped-off front grille is a blunt statement by this two-door coupe. So are the huge-looking 18-inch wheels on the Version 2.0 that I drove. Dramatic flares run along the bottom of the C30 from the front to the rear wheels. Parallel to them, the car's shoulders rise and its roof quickly descends to form smart-looking wedge shapes.

And yet, it isn't until you get to the rear end where Volvo really makes a design statement with the C30: The hatchback is nearly entirely comprised of a huge, squarish back window that extends well below where a traditional design would have it end, creating a dramatic effect. The chrome-tipped dual exhausts help as well.

In the case of the C30 I drove, Volvo also adds to the appeal with a dramatically fresh color scheme. The body coldr of the vehicle was an extremely light mossy green,

almost a bare tint of a hue, while the trim pieces along the bottom were a very deep mocha. Interesting combination with an esthetically pleasing result.

The only down side to this entire design picture is a strange pair of taillights, in which the brake-light strip extending vertically on the sides of the hatch - reminiscent of Volvo's design in other vehicles -are actually adjacent to the arc of the main taillights, producing weird effects. Of course, all of that is only annoying to the drivers behind

For the driver who's actually behind the seat of the C30, it's a big treat. Powered by a turbocharged, 2.5-liter five-cylinder engine, C30 generates 227 horsepower and 236 pound-feet of torque. As a result, toting around a vehicle this small, C30 is able to accomplish remarkable acceleration - about 6.5 seconds zero-to-60 -as well as determined quick moves whatever the driving demands.

Shifting up through the five-speed automatic I drove is extremely smooth as well. At an estimated 19 mpg in the city and 28 mpg on the highway, fuel economy is about where it must be to take advantage of the small dimensions

Inside, C30 is mostly a treat. The first thing you notice

is the extremely high visibility out the windshield, the front side windows and, especially, the huge hatch, all of which is a real treat. However, C30 displays the same blind-spot problems for the driver that are generic to many coupes. And if you're a rear passenger, the seats are so deep and the windows so shallow that the effect is a bit like sitting in a jail cell looking up at a scant chink of a space to the outside.

The interior design is sleek, highlighted by a signature, thin, "floating" or "waterfall" center console that Volvo first incorporated into the S40 and V50. Not only is the visual effect stunning, but there's a handy compartment behind the waterfall stack where you can stash keys, cell phones and other objects safely without having them clutter up the important space right next to the driver's

And, of course, Volvo has used its uniquely sensible approach to climate controls in the C30 as in its other vehicles. An icon of a human shows you exactly where the air stream will be pointing, and all the necessary climate switches and dials are clustered within a few inches of each

And obviously, climate-switch design isn't the only thing that competitors could learn from the C30.



ahead so you can coast instead of brake). The less the DFM flashes and beeps, the better your mileage should be. And better mileage, of course, means fewer trips to the

I spent a few weeks with a DFM in the car. As much as I love the idea behind the product, I do have some quibbles with it.

For starters, it quickly gets annoying. There are times when you have no choice but to accelerate quickly (like when merging onto the freeway) or stomp the brakes (because traffic just came to sudden stand-

So from him to you — if you check the rubber door seal on the refrigerator door and it doesn't meet the frame all across the top of the door, you have a problem. Call your selling dealer and tell them you heard about it in this column.

This is the type of engineering performance at the factory level which never gets to be exposed. In all my years I

have never seen a lower door hinge on a modern refrigerator with only two bolts. They always have three bolts and in this particular case there was a hole already in the hinge to fit the third bolt. I believe somebody decided to try and save a penny, excluded the bolt in doing so and caused a field repair, which should be covered under warranty.

But is it?

During the first year of ownership, your refrigerator is covered under the manufacturer's warranty so if you notice this problem it's a free repair. What about the person who doesn't discover this problem until after the first year warranty is over? Shouldn't that person be taken care of at no charge, after all the problem was caused at the factory and it was repaired at no cost for many other homeowners. Common sense dictates that should be the case, but don't expect a free repair to happen.

In the world of major home appliances, many things happen in production that are never told to the purchasing public. Service bulletins abound which describe what a service technician should do to solve a particular problem with a product. These don't come out in the form of a recall, or information that is given to a homeowner, but rather kept secret only for the eyes of some in the appliance repair industry. In the end, the public pays for

the mistakes created at the factory level.

This whole concept is wrong and unfair.

A gentleman wrote me recently about having to constantly replace a light bulb in his microwave oven. It is only six months old and even though it is under warranty the light bulbs are not covered and the manufacturer has been charging him \$15 for standard light bulbs. He discovered that the light bulbs he was receiving were the wrong voltage and that is why they failed prematurely. He went to the hardware store, purchased a light bulb for \$2.29, and the problem is solved.

There are many thousands of stories to tell about problems created by the manufacturers of major home appliances and there was a day and an era when the manufacturers paid for service calls of this caliber. Those days are gone. Stay tuned.



Restaurants will be competing too for People's Choice and Best Judged chili.

Last year's event was won by Omelet and Waffle Cafe (people's choice) and Station 885 (best judged chili). Other restaurants in Plymouth competing this year include Compari's on the Park, Sean O'Callaghan's, Doyle Tavern, E.G.Nick's, Boulder's, The Penn Grill, 1999 Tavern, Hilton Garden Inn's Great American Restaurant, Don's Drive-In (Novi), and Rocky's Rotisserie, which just opened in Livonia.

Restaurant samples will be available 11 a.m.-5 p.m. on Penniman Avenue in Kellogg Park. Bowls will be available for a \$4 donation, while 2ounce samples will be available for \$1.

still). The DFM doesn't discriminate: It beeps and flashes regardless of the situation.

I found it particularly difficult to placate the DFM when driving around town, where there's a lot of necessary starting and stopping. If a light turns red while I'm approaching it, hey, I gotta hit the brakes. Stop scolding me, DFM!

Indeed, it's the nagging nature of this device that will turn off most users. And I think that lead-footed drivers, the kind who are most likely to benefit from changing their driving habits, are the least likely to buy this product in the first place.

Consider the reaction of a friend I had in the car during my test period. When I explained the function of the curious-looking gizmo on my dash, he looked me square in the eye and said, "You've gotta be kidding."

This is not to say the Digital Fuel Mizer is without value. Quite the opposite: Anyone serious about saving money (and/or helping out the environment) will probably find that the device does indeed change their driving habits for the better.

And if a fleet manager can get his drivers to use and learn from the DFM, the annual savings could be substantial. There's nothing to install and no training required. You just stick it

on the dashboard and flip the on/off switch. Would the savings be substantial enough to justify the DFM's \$249 price tag? I'm not sure, but I suspect few everyday drivers will be willing to invest that kind of money when they could just as easily train themselves.

Don't stomp the gas pedal. Brake as gradually as you can. Keep your tires inflated to the recommended PSI. Replace your air filter regularly. Ask your boss if you can telecommute.

There. If you have trouble remembering all that, write it on a Post-It note and stick it on your dashboard. You'll save money on gas and forego all the annoying beeping.

# **Natura wines express** wine's green movement

ne of the more confusing wine terms is organic. More often than not, it's used incorrectly.

Based on the creation of a National Organic Program by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, an organic wine is now defined

as "a wine made

from organical-

ly-grown grapes

and without any

added sulfites."

The vast

majority of what wine distributors and retailers have been calling organic wines must now, under this definition, be

"wines made from organicallygrown grapes." These wines are allowed to contain up to 100 ppm of added sulfites. Most wines contain far less than this maxi-

There are very few organic wines - those that do not contain added sulfites. The reason? Without addition of sulfites, which act as wine preservatives, the shelf life of a truly organic wine is short. Often, simple shipping of an organic wine causes it to become unstable in the bottle.

As the international wine community has gone green and ecofriendly over the last few years, more grapes are being grown organically.

### **ECO-FRIENDLY CHILE**

In 1998, Emiliana acquired prime acreage in Chile's Casablanca, Maipo, and Colchagua valleys and transformed it into organic and biodynamic vineyards, thus giving birth to Emiliana Orgánico, a unique project in Chile and a pioneering effort in Latin America.

Some wines from organicallygrown grapes carry a hefty price tag. Natura wines produced by Emiliana are wallet friendly.

At \$10 each, the following are value wines for an age that's begun to think "green" seriously.

■ Natura 2006 Carmenere is 87 percent carmenere, the grape that was once mistaken for

merlot in Chile. Grown in Chile's Colchagua Valley and blended with small percentages of syrah, petit verdot, tempranillo and malbec, it expresses ripe cherry and red plum fruits in an easydrinking, mellow wine.

■ Natura 2006 Chardonnay has intense tropical fruit character and is a perfect accompaniment to seafood and shellfish. Grown in Chile's Casablanca Valley, the wine sports lively acidity that makes it food friendly.

■ Natura 2006 Cabernet Sauvignon hails from Chile's Central Valley, well-recognized for the excellence of Bordeaux varieties. Blackberry fruit is highlighted by notes of cocoa. It takes to grilled meats and stronger cheeses.

### CERTIFICATION

Goals of organic grapegrowing include maintaining earth's natural balance, which is believed to showcase the vineyard terroir, or site personality better. Those grapegrowers dedicated to organic grapegrowing believe that organically-grown grapes express the grape variety more fully. Flavors distinguishing each variety are discernable. We found this to be true in the Natura

Not all vineyards claiming to be organic are certified. We believe certification is important. A number of organizations monitor certification and Natura has been certified as organic by IMO Switzerland.

Switzerland's small size has made it aware of ground water pollution and the need for organic farming practices. Thus, a Swiss certifier can be trusted as strict.

If you've been seeking organically-grown produce, seek out some organically-grown wine. Natura is a good place to start for sensibly-priced wines that taste



cine, veterinary or human, why can often be ignored if the situation yields positive results. For instance, if you stop

smoking because it's expensive, that's great ... you're quitting. Granted, you should be quitting for your health, but what does it matter? You still quit ... it's fine.

But what if you hit the Lotto, and money's no longer an issue?

Knowing the best reasons for something can make a difference. It can show why you should or should not do something, and give you the conviction to follow up.

I've long talked about Bob Barker, the recently retired host of The Price is Right. Bob has been an

animal lover for as long as I can remember, and always finished his show by saying "help control the pet population ... have your pet spayed or neutered."

That was great. He was getting people to help stop animal overpopulation.

That's a great reason why that he's giving everyone ... except for people who have only one pet, which will never be in contact with another dog or cat.

They might wonder, why should I get my animal spayed or neutered? Bob told me it was to help control the pet population ... I heard him say so right after the nice young woman won the camper and dinette set! But I will never be adding to the pet population. My critter never leaves my yard.

Spaying and neutering do help control the wildly outof-control pet population, but the reasons for spaying and neutering go way beyond

With females, spaying helps eliminate problems with mammary cancer, as well as diseases like pyometra - a life-threatening uterine infection.

Neutering a male dog helps with prostate problems, as well as decreases the chances that the animal will be hit by a car. (Males tend to catch a scent and get tunnel vision going after it.)

Along with eliminating

much of the awful smell from spraying, neutering a male cat usually makes him a better, quieter companion. It also makes him less likely to roam and be exposed to infectious diseases like Feline Leukemia.

So the reason why to have your pet spayed or neutered. is to give them a longer and healthier life, which is really giving yourself a healthy pet for a longer time.

By the way, speaking of Bob Barker's message about overpopulation, that really is a problem we shouldn't forget about.



# High flavor ingredients save time

Deadline cooking is all about the ingredients. Select the right high-flavor, low-prep ingredients and great meals practically assemble themselves.

But success depends on rethinking your shopping and pantry stocking habits. Convenience is only half the criteria that should influence your buying decisions. Intensity of flavor should get equal weight.

For example, if you're buying bagged shredded cheese to use on salads, pizzas, nachos, maybe even over warm pasta and casserole dishes, opt for one that includes a blend of cheeses, at least one of which should be Parmesan. Its intensely savory flavor adds nuance and complexity.

Here's a list of other high-flavor pantry staples the deadline cook can rely on:

- Capers. These pickled green flower buds explode with salty, savory flavor. Add them to salads, pasta, chicken stirfries, or even blend a few into salad dressings. Go easy on them; they can be quite salty. Rinse if you want to tone them
- Sun-dried tomatoes. Stick with those packed in olive oil,

as they are easiest to work with. Cut into thin slivers, they go great with pasta, stuffed into roasted chicken breasts, sprinkled over pizza or even nachos.

■ Spicy refried beans. Microwave for a warm sandwich spread. Fill wonton wrappers with it, then bake or fry them and dip them in salsa or marinara sauce. Spread it on a bagel, top with cheese and heat

until meltingly good. ■ Olives. Try some of the stuffed green varieties, such as those with feta, almonds or jalapeno peppers in them. Put them in sauces, puree with olive oil for a sandwich spread or use in place of tomato sauce on pizza, or saute them with onions, mushrooms and pep-

pers to top steak. ■ Prosciutto. Swath figs or asparagus with thin slices of this Italian cured ham in it, then give them a quick sit on the grill.

Peanut butter. No, really. Get some of the natural stuff (the one where the oil separates). Blend it with a splash each of water, vinegar, hot sauce and a dusting of black pepper. Toss this with warm noodles or simmer chicken breasts in it.

■ Smoked salmon. Sure, it goes great on bagels with cream cheese. But it's also won-

derful tossed with hot pasta or cut into slivers and sprinkled into a salad with goat cheese, as in the recipe that follows.

# SMOKED SALMON SALAD

START TO FINISH: 15 MINUTES Servings: 2

- 3 cups mixed salad greens 1 earn of fresh corn (raw)
- 4 ounces thinly sliced smoked salmon 3 tablespoons toasted pine nuts
- ¼ cup crumbled goat cheese 1 teaspoon finely chopped fresh dill 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice Salt and freshly ground black pepper Fresh baguette, warmed in a 200 F

Divide the greens between two

servings plates. Set aside. Use serrated knife to carefully cut the kernels from the ear of corn. The easiest way to do this is to stand the ear on it's wide end and saw down the length of the cob. Divide the kernels

between the two plates. Cut the salmon into thin strips and scatter them over each salad. Top each salad with half of the pine nuts, goat cheese and fresh dill. Set aside.

In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, lemon juice, salt and pepper, then drizzle over each salad. Serve with baguette.

The auction is modern style. The North hand is too strong for an opening bid of one no-trump or for a jump raise to three hearts after South's one-heart response. After Key-Card Blackwood elicits information that North holds three of the five key cards (king of trumps counts as an ace), South settles for small slam.

West has an opening lead of king of spades. If you are a finesser, you will draw trumps and take the diamond finesse. That loses and, on regaining lead, you continue by cashing the ace and king of diamonds trying for a 3-3 break. When that doesn't work, try the club finesse. Your combined chances are better than 85 percent but your slam fails.

Correct technique is to win the opening lead, draw the outstanding trumps and then cash the king and ace of diamonds in an attempt to drop the queen. When that doesn't work, lead the jack of spades and discard your remaining diamond, and West is trapped in a deadly endplay.

If West returns a diamond, insert the jack. If East has the queen, you ruff and the 13th diamond takes care of your club loser. A spade return yields a ruff-sluff and a club return is into your tenace. No matter what, the slam is home.
