Commissioner out after 'intolerable' statements

Catherine Johnson is no longer a part the Canton Planning Commission.

Johnson, a longtime commissioner, has stepped down in the wake of comments she made at a Dec. 3 meeting regarding the proposed Hindu Temple rebuild.

While calling some of the Temple's previous actions into question, the former commission secretary said she had heard reports that women at another temple had partici-

pated in public urination. Johnson, who had been on the commission since 1980, is a resident of Glengarry Village, one of three subdivisions surrounding the Temple's 5.6-acre property.

"I asked for her resignation," said Township Supervisor Tom Yack. "In my opinion, the comments were inappropriate, insensitive and intolerable."

Yack was not present for the commission's public hearing but he watched the meeting's video footage twice. He said Johnson has a big heart and called her a "great contributor" to the commission but said her recent comments crossed the line.

Saying she was "very hurt and surprised" by Yack's request, Johnson said she never intended to offend anyone.

"Heavens, no," she said. "I did not mean any offense. I'm not that familiar with the (Hindu) religion and the question of the urination was brought up to me by other people. I did not want to resign but it was an honor and privilege to serve as long as

Glengarry Village homeowner Syl Noetzel said he is saddened by Johnson's departure from the commission.

"This is America and a person should have the right to speak out," he wrote in a letter to the editor to the Canton Observer.

Yack said he expects some residents to disagree with his

"Free speech comes with responsibility," he said, adding that Johnson was representing Canton during her commentary. "Free speech also has consequences."


Yack said this was not the first time he had approached Johnson about her remarks.

"We've talked previously about approach and comments on other issues," he said. Johnson also sat on the

Zoning Board of Appeals. Her resignation was effective immediately.

In its proposal, which has been tabled by the commission, the Temple is looking to demolish its current facility at 44955 Cherry Hill and construct a larger worship center that sits farther from the roadway.



Hopes fade in search for missing man



Rescuers in Mauna Kea, Hawaii, continue to search for a 67-year-old Salem Township man who had been hiking a Mauna Kea trail and may have been caught in a blizzard Dec. 5 that dropped nearly a foot of snow and recorded winds in excess of 70 miles per hour.

However, hope is fading for his daughters in Canton Township and Kalamazoo because today could be the last day of the nine-agency air and ground search for Brian Murphy.

"(Authorities) told us they only will search for five days unless we can give them some reason to search longer," said Bridget Wallman, 43, of Canton Township, one of Murphy's two daughters. They told us they covered three

School board restores busing for K-5 students

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education has restored busing for about 645 K-5 students who were forced to walk to school this year after the district increased the elementary walking distance from a mile to 11/2 miles.

Since announcing the increase in walking distance last spring to save \$206,000 in busing costs, which originally affected 2,400 students, trustees have almost come full circle in restoring busing.

The restoration of the busing cut comes after parents voiced concerns about youngsters walking during the winter months and more frequent traffic jams at the schools, as well as a realization by the Board of Education that the original budget savings will really turn out to be only \$22,500 when busing is restored Jan. 28.

"When we had estimates of over \$100,000 in savings, it was worth thinking about because we had a lot of other cuts we were considering that would affect the classroom," said school board President Judy Mardigian. "As we achieved half the savings and caused a lot of pain for the lower elementary ... a mile and a half is too far, and I would never have my child walk that far."

The board voted 5-2 to restore busing, with Trustees Dianne Gonzalez and Nancy Eggenberger the two dissenting votes.

It's a cut I'm not happy with and causes a lot of hardship for parents, but we don't have the money," Eggenberger said. "I know on the next cuts list we're going to have more and more things that directly affect the academic experience of the children in our schools, and this does not affect that."

Bruce Christenson of Canton Township, who has a second- and fourth-grader walking to $\bar{\mathrm{D}}\mathrm{odson}$ Elementary, is pleased the board reinstated bus-

"It's a good thing for the kids in the district, and I hope they keep that in mind as they go into the next budget year," Christenson said. "It's a long walk, and on bad weather days the parents have to get together to make sure the rides are there both ways."

Community rallies around injured shop owner

"Phenomenal."

That's the word Jill Gaudet is using to describe the response from the Wayne community to a call for help the a gift shop owner who was stabbed numerous times during a robbery Dec. 11.

"Kim (Loveless) called to express how overwhelmed she is with the outpouring of support from the community," said Gaudet, the Wayne Chamber of Commerce executive director in an interview Friday.

"She wants to express her heartfelt thanks."

The chamber is serving as a collection point for the names of business and community members willing to volunteer their time at the shop once it reopens, quite possibly next week. It's been closed since last Tuesday evening when Loveless was attacked by a man as she was closing the shop on Wayne Road just south of Glenwood.

Loveless was forced back into the shop by the man who stabbed her and took her purse before fleeing the store. She was treated at Oakwood Annapolis Hospital in Wayne before being transferred to University Hospital in Ann Arbor.

According to Gaudet, the lifelong Wayne resident "is doing very well," but will remain hos-



Hundreds of people braved dropping temperatures and a sleeting drizzle Sunday to attend the annual Compassionate Friends Candlelight Vigil in Plymouth's Kellogg Park, all with the same goal in mind.

Paying tribute to the children they've lost too soon.

The event, sponsored by The Compassionate Friends-Western Wayne County (Livonia) Chapter, included the dedication of a tree decorated with ornaments with the children's names, the candlelight vigil, a reading of the children's names, poetry and songs.


This year, nearly 400 names were read.





Grad, 76, realizes nursing degree dream

It's never too late to pursue a dream. Just ask Lillian

Anderson. The 76-year-old Coldwater resident joined 47 other Madonna University nursing graduates Thursday at a pinning ceremony at Laurel Manor. Anderson delivered the keynote/inspirational speech and was honored with the writing award and the O'Neill Award for Humanistic Nursing for her compassion and caring.

"She was an inspiration to her fellow students," said marketing director. "There wasn't a dry eye in the room after she told her story."

It hasn't come easily.

"Ever since I was a kid I wanted to be a nurse, but life got in the way," she said Friday. "When I turned 70, I needed a new direction and some friends sat me down and asked what had I always wanted to do and I said I wanted to be a nurse."

Anderson worked 48 years as a secretary, 20 years at Ford Motor Co., retiring in 1995. She already had a degree from Madonna.

"I had graduated from Madonna with a bachelor's

ment. I decided to take business because it tied into my work at Ford Motor Co.," she said. "I thought I was too old to be a nurse, but I guess I'm not."

She actually began her business degree studies in the 1960s but had to put them on hold when her son, Kevin Giedre, was diagnosed with bone cancer. She cared for him until his death at 18 in 1973. She finally earned that first bachelor's degree in 1989.

She registered for Madonna's hospice program in 1991 but never attended classes because her second husband became ill and she cared for him until he died in 2000.

She began the nursing program in 2002 but her daughter, Judy Zammit, had been diagnosed with ovarian cancer. She died earlier this year at age 54.

"She was a 10-year survivor," Anderson said. "She was a fantastic example for so many

Next week, Anderson will be making the long drive from Coldwater to Troy to take Kaplan classes to prepare for the state board exam.

"It's like taking the bar exam, you want to get it right the first time," she said.

Anderson admits she might be too old to become hospital floor nurse but she is interested in working in hospice care.

"For my emergence, I worked at Angela Hospice, a wonderful place," she said.

At Madonna an "emergence" is a real workplace experience allowing students to emerge into the real work world.

"I worked with a preceptor, Paula Bending, who is the epitome of what a nurse should be," Anderson said.

She is looking into doing some home hospice care when she passes her boards.

"What an inspiration, she is," said Teresa Thompson, dean of the College of Nursing and Health. "It's been a pleasure to watch her grow, and care, and give to so many. She's become part of who we are at Madonna."





Anne Marie Graham-Hudak said she doesn't want to see the township spend \$50,000 on an election to do away with \$11,000 in salary hikes, so she has another solution: "The township board needs to make a motion to repeal the raises."

Graham-Hudak, along with her husband, Hadley, have been collecting the signatures of township residents in an effort to force a public vote on the township board's 3-percent raises, which were factored into Canton's 2008 budget and approved at the board's Nov. 27 meeting.

"It's not that the board doesn't deserve the raises-but they need to look at the people they represent," Graham-Hudak said. "I see so many neighbors and friends losing their homes and their jobs. I'm scared of losing my own job."

In order to get a referendum, the Hudaks have to collect 5,600 signatures from township residents that are registered to vote. The petition has to be filed within 30 days of the board's vote. The couple has gotten a small group to help them with their task and are looking for more help.

"As soon as we found out about the raises we knew we had to do something," Graham-Hudak said. "I thought this was very insensitive."

The increases, which will go into effect Jan. 1, will bump Township Supervisor Tom Yack's salary from \$123,372 to \$127,073. Township Clerk Terry Bennett and Township Treasurer Elaine Kirchgatter will get a boost from \$100,708 to \$103,730.

The four township trustee salaries will move from \$12,172 to \$12,537.

Township Trustee Todd Caccamo voted against all of the raises, except for Bennett's increase. Although Township Trustee Todd LaJoy approved the raises for Yack, Bennett

and Kirchgatter, he voted against the trustee increase. The raises amount to

\$11,205. Bennett said putting the issue on a ballot would cost the township about \$50,000.

"The board made the motion to approve the raises and they can unmake it," Graham-Hudak said, adding that the cost of an election would be the fault of the board for not reversing the raises.

"We don't think the township board is doing a bad job but our economy is terrible," Hadley Hudak said.

Yack said the township couple has the right to try to place the issue before voters.

"Citizens have the right to do what they are doing," he said, but urged residents to look beyond the seven raises for the board.

Each of the township's more than 330 employees is scheduled for a 3-percent raise, Yack said. To then deny an increase to Canton's public officials would be "pure politics," he

"There are some people who look to us to be symbols of empathy but this is our livelihood, too," Yack said. "I think we run an efficient operation (but) there are some people who believe we should hurt

with them." While both Graham-Hudak and Hudak expressed doubt at being able to come up with enough signatures in the next few weeks, they said they'll continue spreading the word throughout the community.

"Even if we don't get enough maybe they will be able to see that this many people are upset," Graham-Hudak said. "I wish there was a way for us to tie the raises into the health of the economy."

The homeowner, a 42year-old man, told officers that he had discovered unknown footprints circling his vehicle. The car had not been damaged and nothing had been stolen.


The officer followed the footprints along several streets and discovered that they stopped on the 600 block of Buckingham near


several cars parked along the street. He then noticed that the same footprints had come from a nearby residence and spoke with a woman upon knocking on the door.

square miles by foot with search dogs and on ATVs, and 10 times that by air with two helicopters.

"Part of the problem is some of the huge bushes are 15 feet high and 15 feet in diameter, so they actually have to get inside, which is slowing them down," she said. "They told me the fog was so thick the day he went missing that you could barely see vour feet."

Rescue teams told family members it appears Murphy may have changed his plans and decided to take a shorter walk, possibly getting caught in a less severe storm at the lower

altitudes. Early indications were Murphy planned to hike to the summit of Mauna Kea, which is 13,796 feet. However, he may have been discouraged to do so when he checked into the Mauna Kea Visitor Information Station before his hike. Kelly Seelbinder of

Kalamazoo said her father was wearing khaki shorts, a T-shirt, and tennis shoes without socks in temperatures that reached about 80 degrees.

"He had planned to go all the way to the top, but they told him it was going to get stormy and that he shouldn't go," said Seelbinder, 40, a 1985 graduate of Canton High School. "But we found out (Sunday) he told the people at the visitor's station he only planned to go on a short walk on the trails, only about two-three hours, and had warmer clothes in the car. In the car they found a map open to

the trails close by." The blizzard hit about two hours after Murphy was last seen at the visitor's station. His unlocked rental car was found in the parking lot.

"It was probably still cold and snowy where he was headed, but it wouldn't have been as much snow," Seelbinder said. "The search and rescue people told me that you can hardly see anything on the trails when a storm hits. We're hoping that if he fell, he took cover in the bushes."

Seelbinder said Murphy and a female companion recently traveled to Hawaii, and had gone their separate ways for the day. She said it wasn't unusual for her father to go hiking.

"He loves the outdoors," Seelbinder said. "In the summertime he was always out early in the morning until late at night. He loves to work in the garden, yard work, sports. He's an active person and lives life to the fullest.

"We used to go up in the mountains to ski, and he never got cold," she said. "He's very

smart, and super positive ... a total optimist. If anyone could survive this, it would be him."

Murphy, a retired safety engineer who was contracted to work on the new MGM Grand Casino in Detroit, now manages rental properties. He's the oldest of six children who grew up in Milwaukee. He later moved to Livonia, where the girls mainly grew up and went to school, before moving to the 14-acre parcel in Salem Township and attended Plymouth-Canton Educational

The daughters are hopeful because their father is in relatively good physical shape, having been invited to the 1968 Olympic trials to compete in the decathlon, was track and cross country coach at the old Garden City East High School in the 1970s, and was a ski instructor and avid downhill skier.

"He was not a person who would panic, and wouldn't be upset by the cold," said Wallman.

Wallman said the hardest part is being so far away from where the search efforts are continuing.

"I know it's expansive, that's the frustrating thing," she said. "It's like trying to find a needle in a haystack.

Board missed chance to bolster elections

It's good the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education decided to move its elections and saved themselves \$50,000 a year in election costs.

What's too bad is they had a chance to save twice that and passed on the opportunity.

The board voted this week to move their elections to a odd-year-May cycle, starting in November 2009. That will drop the cost of elections to \$25,000 per election, using

Schoolcraft College as a partner.

Here's the rub: The district could have saved all election costs by moving to an even-year-November schedule, when other elections (state and national) are held, a move that

would have saved the district \$100,000 most years.

The arguments against moving the elections to November don't seem strong to us. The idea that voters will be ballotweary in years where there are many races and other issues seems to place little trust in voters being interested in doing what they come to the voting booth to do.

Likewise, the idea a November election opens the race to more influence by political parties seems naive. If political parties are going to get involved in a school board race, they can do it in May just as easily as they can in November.

In one respect, moving to odd-year-May elections makes it even easier for a particular faction to gain control of the school board. Under the current system, only two seats are up for grabs most years (every fourth year there's only one). Under the new system, four seats will be open in one election, three in the next, making it easier for a political party to run a "slate" of candidates in an attempt to control the board in one fell swoop.

Another effect of this move is the way it affects voter participation. Historically, far more voters turn out for November elections than they do for off-month elections. You could argue voters are just as welcome at the polls in May as they are in November, and therefore it isn't the cycle that causes voter apathy, it's the voters themselves.

But that's a weak argument. History shows more people turn out when more is at stake. The district shouldn't discount that fact in making this decision.

Board President Judy Mardigian is right when she says the district will have to revisit the issue. State officials are rethinking the options for elections. When they do, they'll have to figure out how to save the most money and get the most people involved.

We'd like to think they'll choose the option that gives them the best of both worlds.

Neighbors concerned about temple

On Dec. 3, we attended the Canton Planning Commission meeting to hear about the plan and special land use request of the Hindu Temple located south of Cherry Hill and east of Canton Center. The audience attending were homeowners and taxpayers who should be commended for being interested in maintaining the appearance and values of their properties. Instead, neither the majority of the Planning Commission or the lawyer for the temple, Bryan Amann, seemed interested in hearing about their concerns.

This is the United States of America where people should have a right to express their beliefs and the government entity, in this case the Canton Planning Commission, has a responsibility to listen to requests and objections with an open mind. Unfortunately many of the people attending the meeting left feeling frustrated and believing the whole plan had been previously all worked out with Canton Township and decided upon just the way it was planned by the Hindu Temple.

It is true those homeowners who wished to speak were given time to voice their opinions and objections. Everyone was courteous and polite. It was only when Mr. Amann was given time to respond and made light of everyone's concerns that the attendees interrupted and corrected him on several false statements he made such as: the neighbors had been notified of the rebuild plans previous to the meeting; the property values and appearance of the neighborhood would be improved; and the building would be used only one day per week; the traffic is not a problem and

the berms around the temple property and irrigated and maintained.

Some credit is due the Planning Commission, though, for not approving the proposed plan and requesting Mr. Amann work with the neighborhood.

We are deeply saddened, however, that Planning Commissioner Cathy Johnson, who spoke in favor of the homeowners' concerns, was called three days after the meeting by Supervisor Tom Yack and told to resign her position. This we believe is simply not right. She should have the right to speak out and if this is not so, perhaps the Canton Planning Commission serves no meaningful purpose.

Finally, we remain hopeful the Hindu Temple congregation will want to be good neighbors and agree to resolve all the differences.

This was ironic considering the agenda included an update on the Web site.



Fee-only financial advisers avoid conflicts of interest

Dear Rick: I was approached by a financial adviser. He told me that I pay nothing for his services and that he is paid by the different mutual funds to help people like me. I am somewhat suspicious. Should I be?

Your instincts are correct and you have every right to be suspicious. You were really dealing with a financial salesperson not a financial adviser.

All too often, financial salespeople who work on commission do not want to disclose how they are compensated. Mutual funds and other investment companies make it easy for them to hide what the consumer is paying. It appears the person who you are dealing with is a commission-based salesperson. When you invest in one of the mutual funds that he/she is selling, the money comes off the top and goes directly to the salesperson.

When you purchase a commissioned mutual fund, there are two components of the investment, the commission and the amount actually going into the investment. For example, if you invest \$10,000 in a 7 percent commission (loaded) mutual fund, \$700 goes to the salesperson and only \$9,300 of your money is actually invested.

In addition, some mutual funds have 12b-1 fees, additional sales charges assessed on a year-by-year basis through higher management fees. Money comes out of your account in the form of higher management fees and goes directly to the salesperson as additional compensation.

My problem with commissions and 12b-1 fees is they are typically very difficult for the individual consumer to know what they are paying. The mutual fund companies and the financial salespeople do their best to hide these fees from you.

Anyone who has listened to my radio show or read my columns over the years knows I am not a fan of commissions. I believe commissions create a conflict of interest. After all, why do you think companies that work on commissions such as mutual fund companies and variable annuities offer their salespersons sales incentives such as free trips to sell their products? Obviously, they want the salesperson to concentrate on the sale not on proper planning for the individual.

As far as I am concerned, when someone deals with someone in the financial world, they shouldn't be dealing with a salesperson. They shouldn't be dealing with someone whose loyalty is to the investment company instead of to the client.

Over the years, I have seen many commissioned people in the financial world. Unfortunately, all too often

Unfortunately, there are too few good commissioned financial advisers.

My firm employees and I recommend fee-only advisers who charge for their services and make no compensation from any product they recommend. When advisers are not burdened by conflicts of interest that commissions create, they can operate for the benefit of the most important person — the client.

more exciting because their record was way better than ours and everybody at school was expecting them to win."


Plymouth coach Richelle Reilly said the ball was in the right player's hands with the clock winding down.






"They hit some bombs at the end to make it close," said Van Wagoner.





Holiday hassles

Experts offer tips on sailing through the season stress-free

BY LINDA ANN CHOMIN STAFF WRITER

It's no wonder Dr. Jackie Odom is seeing more patients under stress. All of the shopping, parties and family gatherings leave little time to sleep, eat properly and exercise. According to the Beaumont Hospital psychologist, healthy living is essential to balance the demands of the holidays.

"You have to look at the sources of stress, the increased commitments and responsibilities. The other big source of stress is financial. As much as you might want to give, there might be restrictions. People can't afford to give as they used to given the economy in Michigan. They're getting themselves into debt by buying more than they can afford," said Odom, a licensed marriage and family psychologist. "If there's family conflict they're having to confront that. Dealing with loss at a time when you're supposed to be happy creates stress. If you already have depression when you're supposed to be happy that creates a stress.'

As director of psychology for Beaumont Weight Center, Odom helps patients reduce their intake of food and alcohol. That's especially difficult when holiday parties offer calorie-laden beverages and trays of goodies.

"Stress eating is the worst thing you can do," said Odom of Bloomfield Hills. "They need to identify the sources

of stress, the issue of loneliness for people who don't have families. The second step is to develop strategies to try to minimize stress. It's important to develop a support system, if not your family, make a family of choice. Surround yourself with friends who are caring, a church group, volunteer to serve at a soup kitchen, deliver gifts to a children's unit of a hospital, just wrap packages at a store to get yourself out."

STRESS FACTOR

According to Odom, stress is related to 80 to 90 percent of

Stress decreases immune system functioning making us susceptible to colds, etc. There's a whole list of symptoms like headaches, pain syndromes, digestive problems that may be exasperated with stress," said Odom. "It also increases cholesterol, hypertension. Studies have shown that fat building up in the abdomen can be related to stress. The body is designed to deal with chronic stress as if there's a food shortage so a lot of this make sense."

Odom says it helps to raise spirits by focusing on what you have to be grateful for and writing it down.

"I suggest to patients during the holidays to look at the year that's just passed, look at the goals you've accomplished and what goals you still need to work on for 2008, all the different areas of your life. Look at trying to balance yourself as



best as you can," said Odom, who is challenged by gift buying for her 9-year-old daughter's teachers and preparing to visit relatives in Florida with her daughter and husband.

"I exercise, walk a lot on an indoor track every day and eat healthfully," said Odom. "I enjoy spending time with my daughter. We have two puppies who I love walking and I enjoy helping the Michigan Humane Society to support

cancer research and trying to raise funds."

Sandra Finkel meditates early in her day and then again later in the evening. Throughout the year, she shares stress relieving techniques in prevention and rehabilitation classes for the cardiovascular medicine division at University of Michigan Hospital in Ann Arbor.

"There are a lot of links between stress and heart

disease. The stress alone can increase risk factors," said Finkel, a stress management specialist and manager of stress management services at the University of Michigan Hospital. "The first thing is to recognize how much we increase our stress through our thoughts. We need to have more of an awareness that we're creating more stress by

WAYS TO COPE

Finkel suggests practicing techniques such as relaxation, deep breathing, meditation, journaling and imagery, and to eat more fruits, vegetables and whole grains, lean protein sources like legumes, and drink plenty of water. Finkel exercises during her lunch hour in the fitness center at work.

"Plan activities according to your values. That may mean saying no to going to the party you hate if you want more family time, more time to yourself," said Finkel, who celebrated Hanukkah with her husband's family in Chicago. Finkel works full time and is the mother of two children, ages 10 and 14. "And let whatever actually happens be fine. You make your plans but you have to let go and recognize what the reality is. Find aspects in every situation to savor and enjoy. Young children have this wonderment that we can adopt. There are a lot of strategies I teach people that don't actually take a whole lot of their time like breathing for five minutes with your eyes closed."

Finkel teaches a six-week stress management class beginning 5:30-7 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 16. The cost is \$118.


my point across? Big Mouth in **Garden City**

DON'T STOP MOVING


This time of year brings on heavy work. You have leaves to gather, spring clothes to put away and winter garb to bring out of storage. The effort strains the knees, necessitating in some cases, a doctor's appointment to drain excess fluid from the knee.

Usually, taking fluid out of the knee and injecting a steroid into it suffices to resolve the knee problem. But not always. The fluid may return bringing up the question: "Am I doing too much?" Your doctor is not likely to agree with you. Rather, he will take the view not that you should do less, but that he should do more. If your knee problem was only one of an unexpected twist with irritation, then the first draining should suffice. If you have return of the fluid, he needs to investigate further to answer why the swelling has re-occurred.

The medical community is aware of the importance of activity in preserving your mental and physical stamina. Return of knee swelling requires investigation, not the recommendation for you to just do less.

In most instances recurrence of swelling indicates that you have osteoarthritis of the knee. If x-rays of the knee do not confirm this diagnosis, then an MRI is in order. This imaging delineates internal damage such as ligament tears or injuries to the knee menisci. In turn, treatment can provide sufficient relief to allow you to maintain the activity needed for good mental and physical well being. Therapy may include joint injection for osteoarthritis and knee arthroscopy for ligament and meniscal tears.

Today the job of medicine is to keep you moving.







Unleashing talent

Volunteers create sturdy leather harnesses for pups at Leader Dogs for the Blind

Brent Fecteau and Bob Griffis craft about 400 dog harnesses from scratch every year. They turn cow-sized swatches of leather into leashes — about 600 a year. And they create thousands of key fobs from leather

The two retired men spend about four hours twice weekly in the tack shop at Leader Dogs for the Blind, in Rochester, making key equipment for guide dogs and their human visually impaired companions.

And they do it all for free. "I wanted to do something useful," said Griffis, a Rochester Hills resident, who holds a Ph.D. in chemical engineering. When he retired as an engineer at Ford 10 years ago, he sought out volunteer work at the school, starting first in its mail room and moving to the tack work room six years ago.

"When you retire, you've got to do something to fill in the 40 hours that you worked before," he said, adding that his wife, Doris, volunteers in other departments at the facility.

Fecteau, of Shelby Township, holds an "unused" master's degree in art and retired from teaching math seven years ago. He started volunteering at Leader Dogs for the Blind in the mail room and started working with Griffis about five years ago.

"I Googled volunteer work to see what would come. I saw Leader Dog. I know a lot of people who have dogs and I like them all. I figured, you can't go wrong," Fecteau said.

Together, the pair create all of the collars, leashes, and harnesses that Leader Dogs for the Blind teaches students to use as they follow their canine guides. Randy Horn, a trainer who's also in charge of the tack room, pitches in with sewing when he's not working with dogs or dogstudent teams.

USING EQUIPMENT

"The lead is used to connect the person to the dog and the leash is used to facilitate relief time and also to administer corrective measures they have to use or to keep the dog close at

hand," Horn described the handmade equipment. "The harness is something we teach students to use to follow the dog. It's a tool they use that also tells the general public or anyone in their proximity that they use a dog from Leader Dogs. That's probably the single biggest problem that graduates have - people want to play with their dog."

Blind and visually impaired persons who qualify for a dog from the school spend 26 days training with their new fourlegged friend. That's after the dog has trained for 16 weeks with an instructor. Training, room and board, the dog and its handmade leather leash, collar and harness are free to the student.

Manufacturing the equipment in-house keeps costs down and enables the school to better tailor pieces to different sized dogs.

"It's a good cause and we help them save a lot of money, Fecteau said. Griffis said the school initially bought leashes and harnesses from a source at the Hazel Park Race Track. The school eventually started producing the items, first with a staff member and then with volunteers.

"If they weren't doing it we'd have to spend a whole lot more time in here," Horn said. "With these guys here it makes my life a To find out more about volunteering whole lot easier. And they know what to do, which really helps."

MADE WITH PRIDE

They also maintain high expectations for their own work.

"You want to make sure that whatever you're making, it's like you're making it for yourself. You don't want to put out anything that would hurt the dog," Fecteau said. "You don't want to leave rivets on if there's a possibility you'll cut your hand if you can't see them. You want to make it like it's yours."

"We want everything to be first class," Griffis added.

Griffis and Fecteau learned leather working on the job, in the tack room. The cut pieces, pound out notches for buckles, attach hardware and burn the Leader Dogs logo on each piece. The harness handle is the only part they don't create from scratch.

"It's actually pretty easy," Griffis described the process of cutting the leather with a razorsharp tool called a draw gauge. "We haven't had anyone here nicknamed 'stubby' yet."

In his spare time at home, Griffis also occasionally makes braided leather leashes that he gives to staff members.

"This has my name on it and everything," said instructor Katie Stamm, showing off one of Griffis' special leashes.

"It's awesome. I love it."

Dr. Grinstein was born in Russia, and came with his parents to Buffalo, New York at the age of 5. Both of his parents were physicians. He received his BA and MD from the University of Buffalo. He and Adele moved to Detroit, Michigan in 1942, where he received his psychoanalytic training. Dr. Grinstein was a practicing psychoanalyst for over 50 years. He was most proud of his clinical work, helping his patients to achieve fuller, happier lives. For many years he was Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Wayne State University in Detroit. He was past president of the Sigmund Freud Archives in New York City, and of the Michigan Psychoanalytic Institute. Dr. Grinstein was a prolific writer and researcher. He compiled the Index of Psychoanalytic Writings, which, before the Internet, was the only way to do research in the field. He was the author of numerous psychoanalytic books, including On Sigmund Freudis Dreams, Freud at the Crossroads, Conrad Ferdinand Meyer and Freud, and Freudis Rules of Dream Interpretation. He also wrote psychoanalytic studies of Beatrix Potter, Wilkie Collins, and Edwin Arlington Robinson, as well as numerous essays and papers. His wife, Adele, worked closely with him on all of his publications. His warmth, incredible generosity, and great spirit will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved him. M. J. Ryan, executive coach at Professional Thinking Partners Inc., outside of San Francisco, helps people change. She observes that some people "aren't really good at initiating things, keeping the ball rolling and finishing. If you're not a great finisher, things trail off. This is why we need another employer who's skilled at completing other people.'

'SATISFACTION STOP' We do need other people, but how can they help us reach our objectives at work? Debi Yohn, counseling psychologist to expatriates in Shanghai. suggests that you draw a line between positive people and the negative ones. The latter, she says, remain negative, refusing to make the changes

Some projects necessary to turn their negative experiences to and some objectives positive." This is an important concept. What do you do next?

Karlin Sloan of the Karlin Sloan & Co. leadership development consultancy in Chicago says, "Simply asking for help isn't the best way to go. "You might ask a person to remind you of the reward of your project, its benefit, at critical moments when your spirit sags. The reward could be something as simple as an improved retrieval system to cut down on research time, thanks to your computer conversion. She also indicates how restorative and motivational lunching out with others may be when you've reached a benchmark or walking around the block together. Recruit someone to celebrate with you at what Ryan calls "a satisfaction stop.

Ryan further points out that a conversation with projects may be useful in providing "ideas about what you need to do to finish things off. This would vary, depending upon the type of work. It might be that you need more information. He may help you figure out the how."

Sloan directs you to "be specific about the help or resource you need, such as borrowing time from an administrative assistant. The more specific you

are, the easier it is to ask for help, and the simpler it is for a colleague to assist you." This tactic brings a strategic benefit, too. Being asked "makes people feel important and necessary, and it ultimately builds healthy, collaborative working environments," she says.

Harriet Vines, author of "Age Smart," suggests "taking stock. Make and prioritize a To-Do list and delegate tasks where possible" (Llumina Press, \$13.95). She mentions the importance of

"promising to repay in-kind when they need you." Robert Tuchman, president of sports marketing company TSE Sports & Entertainment in New York City, adds, "The key thing in getting others on board and motivated is to praise their work. Allow them to take the credit for the project. Even if you are the one doing the majority of the work, it will empower them to finish the project and give them confidence in future dealings.

Marathoner Lou Manza, chair of the Psychology Department at Lebanon Valley College in Annville, Pa., says that whether a marathon is literal or not, it can be very helpful to remind yourself, happily, that your co-workers and employer expect you to reach the finish line. In his case, the reminder goes something like this: "My dad and my kids are expecting me to do that. So is my wife, who gave

birth three times and suffered." He considers it important to remind yourself of your responsibilities. Meanwhile, he advises, if you need a break, ask for 15 minutes of time out or a slightly-extended lunch break.

"I'll also focus on another runner," he discloses, "one who is about 100 yards ahead. If I concentrate on trying to catch that runner, it takes my mind off the pain. "That runner might well be another person in the company who's striving to reach a goal, too.
