# Family of dead girl ready for murder trial to start

Carol Poole's fate will soon be decided by 12 jurors.

The trial of the Canton Township woman, who is accused of causing the September 2006 death of 2year-old foster daughter, is scheduled to begin Monday in Wayne County Circuit Court in Detroit.

Poole, 42, has been charged with felony murder, firstdegree child abuse and involuntary manslaughter in the death of Allison Newman.

# Blazing a new kind of trail


Construction crews are moving full speed ahead on Canton's latest recreational foray — a trail that will traverse one of the township's last wooded corridors and provide a new kind of opportunity for residents.

The first phase of the Lower ouge Recreation Trail which will be constructed of a crushed stone/slag-like material, is expected to be completed this spring. It will run west along the Lower Rouge River from the power lines of the ITC corridor (near Lilley) to just east of Sheldon. That's a total of about 2 1/2 miles of trail.

Ultimately, plans are for the trail to connect the area around the Summit near Canton Center Road all the way to the recreational trail that runs along I-25, which is in the midst of current and planned repairs. When the new trail is done, users will have about six miles of trail to take advantage of.

In addition to the trail itself, a trailhead area is being constructed off of Morton Taylor Road just north of Michigan Avenue. It will be the main

Circuit judge eases gag order in murder case

Parents and friends of the two teenagers accused in the murder and beheading of a River Rouge man are once again free to talk about the

Wayne County Circuit Judge Annette Berry lifted a gag order imposed in November on the families of Jean Pierre Orlewicz and

Alexander Letkemann by 35th District Judge Michael Gerou.

The judge did, however, continue the gag on lawyers and law enforcement officials connected to the case.

Orlewicz, 17, a Canton High School senior who lives in Plymouth Township, and Letkemann, an 18-year-old Westland resident and former Livonia Churchill student, face first-degree murder and mutilation of a corpse charges in connection with the Nov. 7

River Rouge.

If convicted, they face life in prison without possibility of parole.

Gerou had issued the gag order Nov. 29 after a motion made by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office and supported by Orlewicz's attorney, Joseph Niskar.

The motion came in the wake of a press conference and several publicized comments made by Peter Letkemann,

The teenagers, who are being held without bond, go to trial April 7.

In the same order, Berry said any negotiated plea must be entered by Feb. 1.





It's not what you think your house is worth, but rather what you can sell it for on the open market. Home values have plummeted in Michigan over the last few years and your balance sheet should reflect that. The difference between your assets and

liabilities is your net worth. It is important to put on the list the amount of liabilities and the terms (i.e. interest rate and length of loan).

While getting your financial house in order, I also recommend you figure out what it costs to live for a month using a cash-flow statement. This is a listing of what comes in and what goes out on a monthly basis. It's essential to good financial planning to know what it costs to live a month. A cash-flow statement allows you to determine what your increased cost of living is on a yearly basis.

One thing everyone should do is prepare a record keeping system. Important documents should be kept in one location and someone should know how to access that information in case of an emergency. In addition, good record keeping helps when it comes time to prepare a tax return.

Getting and keeping one's financial house in order is not easy. In addition, for most it's not a task that they can assign to someone else or even hire someone to do. However, the benefits are substantial.

# Trial date set for pair accused of murder, dumping body



# Airport city is hope for future

The future is in the sky.

At least that's what many Wayne County leaders are hoping.

County Executive Robert Ficano has become the leading area evangelist for something called an "aerotropolis." This is the term used by John Kasarda, director of the Kenan Institute of Private Enterprise and professor of management at the Kenan-Flagler Business School, University of North Carolina. Kasarda sees a bright future for communities that develop around their airports, in the way past communities developed around seaports and railroad centers. His message has resonated here.

The argument goes that Wayne County is a prime location for a world-class airport city. The county has two airports along I-94 with a lot of open land for development. The idea is that high tech companies in need of quick delivery and warehousing will locate around airports with international connections. This will spur other development—light industrial, retail, entertainment and residential.

An "aerotropolis" will serve the needs of the auto industry, but it will also attract the new cutting edge businesses that will lead us into a more stable economic future. The location of the airports, centered between the state's largest urban area and its leading research university, make it ideal.

Ficano, Gov. Jennifer Granholm, Oakland County Executive L. Brooks Patterson and others have also been pushing for greater economic ties with China and its immense marketing potential for whatever products develop along the airport corridor. World trade and airport development are critically linked.

Initial steps have been taken as Detroit Renaissance has put the aerotropolis at the top of its business plan for the future.

At a time when despair seems to have gripped Southeast Michigan in a death clinch, it's good to know that local leaders are looking to the sky and seeing a brighter future.

#### Repealing raises absurd

The recent attacks on the Canton Township Board of Trustees for members' decision to give themselves a 3-percent raise ("Residents trying to repeal raises for elected officials," Dec. 16) were expected, as they always are, but trying to repeal the raises has gone past plain silly and into the realm of the absurd.

It appears that all parties agree the board deserves the raise, but somehow the board picked the "wrong time" to give itself the raise. In this time of economic turmoil in Michigan, the board's action was somehow "insensitive" when so many Canton residents are not in the best of financial positions.

"When we had our 5-year master plan recently, by far the number one thing residents wanted was more trails," he said. "This gives us that opportunity for passive recreation. It gives us something we didn't have. We've got lots of parks, but this takes us to another whole level."

In addition to walking, hiking and biking, Sharp said the new trail could be used for cross country skiing in the winter, special events, and possibly even for fishing (there are possible plans for a barrier free fishing deck).

Another group interested in getting involved with the project is the Michigan Mountain Bikers Association. Member Gary Anderson is a Canton resident and has worked on laying out bike trails in the Brighton State Recreation Area, as well as parks in Ann Arbor and Novi. Anderson has

had discussions with township officials about doing the same along the new trail system.

Anderson is proposing beginner to intermediate skill level trails with possible multiple loops starting with about 3-5 miles of trails and adding more in the future. He said members of his group could also act as volunteers and maintain the trails.

There is also a Lower Rouge Recreation Advisory Group made up primarily of residents, which is accepting members. They will meet at 7 p.m. on Wednesday at Summit on the Park.

Bob Belair, the township's environmental engineer, has also worked extensively on the project. He said the township has applied for money from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund, so they can build six foot bridges across the river, which will allow them to connect the different phases of the trail. The Department of Natural Resources has approved the request, but it must also be approved by the State Legislature before Canton will see any money. If that happens, the township will get the money in 2009.

Once everything is done, users will get an up close look at forested wetland and upland areas containing plenty of native plant and animal species. While he likes the recreational aspects of the trail, he is just as excited about the educational possibilities. He hopes users come away with a new way of looking at nature.

"I think the main thing about this is going to be education. We're already going to have school groups come down here. And we're looking for other educational opportunities, as well, such as informational signage like we have a Flodin Park," Belair said.

One of the goals is to work with local scouting groups to build and maintain wildlife habitat projects in the area.

Longtime Canton resident
Joan Lager is excited about the
project. In her younger years,
she rented horses from the
Hawkins family stables and
rode them in very area where
the trail is currently being
built.

"This is the final frontier of the township," she said. "This is the Canton I remember when I was little. This is a really neat project."



Earning Most Valuable Wrestler medals were Monroe's Ryan Jones at 103 and Richmond's Mike Lasinski, who went 3-0 at 189.



# Plymouth grad Jones' move to RB pays dividends at Hope

When opportunity knocked this past fall, Brent Jones did more than just answer the door.

He invited it in and convinced it to stay a while. When one of Hope College's starting running backs was suspended for the first three games of the 2007 season, Jones seized the starting spot and ran with it.

The former Plymouth High School gridiron standout churned out 632 total yards -629 rushing and 3 receiving - in nine games.

Among his many highlights were two 100 yardplus efforts, including a monster 37-carry/157yard day against Tri-State (Indiana) University.

All in all, it was an incredibly successful campaign for the sophomore — especially when you consider he started his college career as a wide receiver and spent most of his prep days as a quarterback.

"I didn't get to play much last year," Jones said, reflecting on his fast-moving steps up the Flying Dutchmen's depth chart. "I was a slot receiver in a pro-set offense.

"I traveled with the team and I earned a varsity letter, but I played mostly on special teams."

Jones' big break came last spring when the Hope coaching staff shifted the speedy, elusive player to running back.

"They knew I didn't like playing receiver, so they gave me a chance at running back," said Jones, whose dad, Steve, played the position at Grand Valley State. "I moved up to No. 2 (on the depth chart) before the season started, then when our starting running back was suspended for the first three games, I was able to get the ball."

Jones didn't hesitate when asked about the biggest difference between high school and Division



Establish a Local Shopping Land Use designation on the Future land Use map for office and neighborhood commercial development intended to provide convenient goods and services that usually serve residents in the immediate vicinity. Local shopping Areas should be located at intersections of primary collector and arterial roadways. Policy 1.2.1b (NEW)

Establish an Office/Residential land use designation on the Future land use map for office and condominium development. These areas should be located in areas adjacent to existing residential neighborhoods as a transition from higher intensity commercial or industrial uses. Areas designated for Office/Residential Use shall be indicated on the Future Land Use Map. Areas previously designated as "Local Shopping/Office Recommended" shall be redesignated to "Office/Residential.: All areas designated on the future land Use Map as Office/Residential shall allow for consideration of Office (O-1) and Single-Family Attached (R-6)

Amend Policy 1.52 and 1.5.3 relative to the Mixed Use designation **Policy 1.5.2** 

The Mixed Use designation shall allow for the consideration of Light Industrial Research (LI-R), Office (0-1), and Regional commercial (C-3) and Multiple Family Residential (MR) zoning, pursuant to the standard criteria for rezoning. and Proper transitions from one zoning district to another shall be maintained. Policy 1.5.3

Use of the Planned Development District (PDD) option is encouraged to allow flexibility of use, layout and design. the PDD option also promotes clustering to foster preservation of open space and natural resources. 



# Pedometers spur people to walk another mile

Dr. Caroline Richardson believes it's only a matter of time before physicians and researchers find a way to encourage Americans to walk on a regular basis. It's no secret that physical activity helps prevent and treat certain diseases. Could pedometers, a small counting device worn on a belt or waistband, motivate people to walk further once they make the decision to get moving?

The results of a recent walking program study at the University of Michigan Health System and VA Ann Arbor Healthcare System show those wearing a pedometer increased the steps they took by about one mile a day.

"In 1996, the surgeon general released a report on physical activity and the health connection," said Richardson, who became interested in the link as a resident that same year. "It got me interested in this known treatment and how to get people to do that. In 1964, the surgeon general came out with a report on the link to smoking and lung cancer. It took us a while to learn how to help people quit smoking. We're just at the beginning of helping people to get more active."

Richardson was the lead author of the six-week study that divided type-2 diabetics into two groups. All were sedentary adults. Half of the participants counted their steps all day long, the structured goals group only used the pedometer when walking for at least 10 minutes. The participants who wore a pedometer throughout the day reported they were more satisfied with their program.

"It turned out both groups increased their walking, but the 10-minute group didn't like it. They felt they didn't get credit for the steps they walked throughout the day," said Richardson, who some-

times walks to work from her Ann Arbor home. Richardson is an assistant professor in the department of family medicine at the U-M Medical School and research scientist at the Veterans Affairs Health Services Research and Development at the VA Ann Arbor Healthcare System. The study was published in November in the International Journal of Behavioral Nutrition and Physical Activity.

Participants used uploading pedometers that plug into a computer. The data helped calculate goals for the next week. Over time, the required amount of steps increased.

"10,000 steps a day is a lot, particularly for people who haven't been doing a lot and have health problems," Richardson said. "For a healthy person, 10,000 steps a day might be a good goal. If you're sick, 8,000 might be good. Physicians or trainers might be able to help you set goals.

"Using a pedometer is most effective for people who have been sedentary and not active before. If you don't know how much to do, you feel in the dark. You have to set goals. Health behavior research shows setting goals is

critical. Pedometers help people to do that. Some people don't need pedometers. Some people walk at a mall and they know they've walked so far because it's measured so they can set goals. For most people, they fit walking in and don't know how much they do. You need goal setting and logging of your results. We used online to do coaching and goal set-

A future study is

being planned that will allow participants to receive support as part of an e-community which uses pedometers as part of a walking program.

"They'll be able to leave messages for other people and get messages. Giving social support is important in keeping people active," said Richardson, who recommends visiting Web sites for online support. She is a consultant for walkingspree.com.

"Getting a walking buddy can be critical as is in winter in Michigan finding an indoor place to walk or getting the right clothes to walk," she said.





# Take time before replacing pet cat

My cat just died and I'm feeling lonely. I've asked my dad for a new one, but he says that I'm not ready yet. How can I prove to my dad and myself that I'm responsible enough to have another pet? Lonely Garden City

I'm sorry to hear about your cat; it's a very sad thing when our pet dies. It's kind of like losing a friend — a friend that

never argues with you and loves you no matter what. Feeling lonely is normal so is feeling angry or sad or depressed. Your dad might be trying to give you some time


to adjust before bringing a new cat home. But, if he feels that you didn't take good enough care of your cat, he might not want to bring a new cat home because it would mean more work for him! Give yourself time to accept the loss of your cat, enough time so that when you think about your cat you're able to smile instead of cry. Then talk to your dad and find out why, exactly, he thinks you're not ready for another one. I also encourage you to make yourself a list of all the reasons you want another cat; many times we rush into getting a new pet as a way to replace" the one who died.

However, if your list seems to indicate that you're looking for a "replacement," give yourself more time. If you get a new cat too soon, you'll end up resenting the new cat because he's not your old cat! Together, you and dad can work out a plan where you are able to show him that you're ready and he's able to see that you're ready for

Garden City Being a teen is tough. Being the parent of a teen can be equally tough. I think the key to making these years easier is to have open communication. This can be difficult for both sides you have all kinds of emotions rolling around (making it hard to keep a level head) and your dad has all kinds of knowledge he wants to pass on to you (making it hard for him to listen). Sometimes, the problem isn't that Dad doesn't care - sometimes the problem is that he cares too much. My advice is to sit down with dad and talk about how you're feeling. Let him know that you feel the two of you don't get along that well and share with him the things you've done to try to "fix" this problem. Then, ask him if he sees it the same way. # Sweet Dreamzzz carries on mission in new home

Nancy Maxwell knows the benefits of a good night's sleep. As executive director of

Sweet Dreamzzz Detroit, she is determined that every young child looks forward to each night. The group provides sleep essentials to children.

Maxwell shared one story. "One little boy in Pontiac told us that after he received a sleep kit, his back didn't hurt any more because he had been sleeping on his side with his back up against the couch to keep warm and using a baby blanket to cover himself," Maxwell said. "The sleeping bag gives him his own environment

and keeps him warm." Some children have had to share toothbrushes and beds and put themselves to bed.

The group's main focus has been to assist children in Detroit, typically at schools that have 75 percent or more children who receive a free lunch, based on household income.

"Principals and children have told us that children are coming to school tired and falling asleep at their desk," Maxwell said. "We are educating them on the importance of a good night's sleep. We also send home information for their parents."

Sweet Dreamzzz Detroit recommends no TV or use of a computer one hour before bed.

"You need to give your mind a chance to rest," Maxwell said.

Every child needs a minimum of nine hours of sleep or 540 minutes. The younger children need closer to 10 or 11 hours of

# ETHICS AND REPORTING IN THE NEW YEAR



WORKWISE

might make you wonder how you could improve your work life, particularly if you've encountered an Mildred L. ethical problem. Culp

Patricia Harned, president of the independent non-

profit think-tank Ethics Resource Center (ERC) in Arlington, Va., says that you can spot one when you're in "a situation requiring you to make a decision about the right thing to do, where the outcome impacts another person.' Her organization recently released the results of a study of 1,929 business sector respondents.

Marjorie Doyle, global practice leader for Ethics and

Compliance Solutions at LRN Professional Services, headquartered in Los Angeles, differentiates between ethical lapses that are "high-risk activities -- such as preferential treatment, the sharing of company secrets, embarrassing a person publicly, inappropriate public communication and a violation of laws -- and lesser-risk -such as taking credit for another's work, using influence, (or) being abusive or hostile." She adds that the behavior flouts company policies or the law, or is inappropriate.

define right from wrong," according to Samantha Derrick, Human Resources manager of Ultralife Batteries Inc., in Newark, N.Y. CONDUCT

All three of these sources consider ethical violations both an organizational and employee issue. Doyle puts more weights on the organizational side. Harned maintains that "organizations set the standard for their employees, but decision-making often involves an individual or a couple of individuals." But organizations and employees don't always work together on these problems.

In fact, ERC finds that 54 percent of employees didn't report, out of a sense of futility. What actions were taken? ERC research indicates that "more than one-third who saw misconduct chose to resolve the issue themselves rather than report through official company channels. Two in five of these employees did not report, because they would have had to report the misconduct to the person involved, and one in four were not aware of any mechanism to report anonymously.'

Harned observes, "Only three percent (of respondents) used an anonymous helpline:

-- "43 percent chose to go to their supervisor, where they had an immediate relationship; -- "34 percent, to another member in higher


- "13 percent went to a responsible person within the company.'

ERC considers the 12 percent of people who don't report "significant." ON THE GROUND

"Almost every decision in the workplace has an ethical component," Harned states. "There has been at lea one major incident of misconduct in every job I've had," f which she used company channels. She says that she didn always need to know the outcome, because it was irreleva to her work. Doyle increased her reporting as her seniority grew.

Incidents occurred "on a pretty regular basis . . . at least a couple a month." She comments that many weren't intentional, resulting from misunderstood policy. She didn't always know the outcome, but she did trust that the system was working. She points out that a person might have lost a bonus or a job, but for privacy, companies didn't fill her in. "The importance isn't that they happened," she states, "but that they were raised, dealt with and clarified."

Derrick, herself, has never reported an ethical lapse. She indicates that approximately half of the employees at her manufacturing company prefer an anonymous reporting system, such as SilentWhistle, by Allegiance Inc., in the Salt Lake City suburb of South Jordan, Utah. The

telephone-based SilentWhistle routes the information to the correct individuals without disclosing its source. SilentWhistle uses a case identification number and/or password to allow employees to follow up.

If you're one of the lucky people in a company where there's someone you trust to discuss sensitive information, more power to you. But if you're the least bit concerned about disclosure, you might feel more comfortable reporting anonymously.
