## Land plan at stake

# Voters face big choices tomorrow

Tomorrow, it's up to the voters.

The campaign charges and counter-charges have been made, the candidates have had their say, the signs have proliferated throughout the township, and the mailings and flyers have been distributed.

In Canton, as across the state, voters will be determining the political futures of Democrats and Republicans in national, state, county and local elections.

On the national level, Canton residents will be asked to while the list of challengers for retiring U.S. Senator Philip Hart's seat down to two, while incumbent U.S. Rep. William Ford (D-Taylor) is unopposed in the primary, as is his November Republican opponent James D. Walskey.

State Rep. Thomas Brown (D-Westland) will face opposition from Brian Walker on the Democratic side of the ballot, while Republican challenger Brian Kidston runs unopposed.

At the county level, voters will be asked to vote for a host of candidates vying for eight offices.

Only incumbent county prosecutor William Cahalan is unopposed in the primary on the Democratic side of the ledger. Re-

publicans, however, are contesting only three races among themselves: Register of deeds, county prosecutor, and county commissioner from the 27th district.

AT THE LOCAL level, Supervisor Robert Greenstein's slate of candidates is being contested heavily, with the exception of John Flodin, dean of the board after 20 years service as clerk.

Republican challengers for every office are unopposed, and the possibility of heavy cross-over voting exists.

Contesting Greenstein, who is finishing his first term as supervisor, is Harold Stein, a virtual unknown at the start of the campaign.

Basing his assault on Greenstein's land use plan, and police reserve program, the challenger, with his own slate of candidates, has run a vigorous campaign. His slate includes Anne Bradley for treasurer and Gene Daley for trustee.

If Stein wins in the primary, it will spell

certain death for major portions of Greenstein's land use plan, and the reserve police force, as it is presently constituted.

As the campaign wound down, Stein was unwilling to assess his chances. "I've been campaigning very hard to get across to the people what I feel is wrong with this township. I think it's time we returned to our original style of true representative government. Accountability is the name of the game," Stein said.

"I think we've picked up a lot of supporters, but I won't know until Tuesday the true feelings of the people. I'm running hard. I do want the job, and I'm doing all I can to get elected. This is not a spite campaign. I want the job and I feel I am well-qualified."

STEIN SAID he didn't think the turnout, anticipated at about 50 per cent by some township observers, will affect the outcome of the election.

"The voters are either satisfied or they're not and I don't know how to call it. It's a tough campaign and if I lose it won't be because I didn't work hard."

Stein's final push will involve more door-to-door campaigning and a mass-mailing slated for Monday.

Greenstein differed with Stein on the effect the turnout would have on the final result.

"The outcome for the team absolutely depends on the number of voters. The team should be extremely successful if there is a large turnout, so that the true feelings of the people are known."

"A small turnout could mean the end for every team member, including the supervisor."

Greenstein said he expected the 800 votes against the master land use plan to be cast for Stein. "They'd come to the polls if there was a tornado. I wouldn't say they were necessarily for Stein, but they are against the plan and its proponents."

Greenstein's major emphasis in the waning days will be distribution of the Canton Democratic newspaper, hand delivered "to every residence in the township" along with continued door-to-door campaigning.

WHILE GREENSTEIN would not guess as to the fate of his team of candidates, which includes incumbent Treasurer Carl Parsell, incumbent Trustee Jerry Cheske, Flodin, and Joyce Willis running for trustee, he said, "I'd like to think we will all sink or swim together. It hasn't been a one man job and each member of the team is exceptionally qualified."

If any races are up for grabs, it is the two positions for trustee. Cheske and Willis will face three challengers.

Two are independents, Lynne Goldsmith. (Continued on page 3A)

## Rehab grants now available

Residents of two Canton subdivisions who wish to correct building violations in their homes this year may now obtain applications for housing rehabilitation grants at Canton Township offices, located on Geddes, west of Michigan.

Residents of the program's target areas—McIntyre Manor near Ford and Sheldon and Dye Brothers Subdivision near Michigan and Sheldon—may obtain a maximum \$4,000 grant to bring their homes up to code, if they meet federal low-income requirements.

Township officials are limiting this year's grant program to residents of the two subdivisions, despite earlier plans to distribute some grant money to other areas.

According to Mike Gorman, deputy township treasurer, the change in plans was necessitated by requirements of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), administrator of the federal Community Block Grant program of which Canton's \$22,000 housing grant is a part.

HUD'S GUIDELINES, Gorman said, require identification of specific areas for purposes of distributing the federal funds.

But Gorman and other township officials hope to receive an additional \$100,000 in federal housing funds next year to satisfy the needs of other township residents as well as those in McIntyre and Dye Brothers Subdivisions who will not receive grants this year.

"I'm hoping to get around 10 applications for this \$22,000," Gorman said. "We're hoping for as many as possible, so we can show the need for more money next year."

Township employees, Gorman said, have already delivered 150 letters, explaining the grant program, to residents of the two subdivisions.

Under guidelines of the program, resi-

dents' applications will be screened by a three-person committee, composed of Canton building inspector Charles Thompson, the Rev. Raimor, pastor of Tri-City Assembly of God, and Mary Perna, manager of Security Bank and Trust.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS will determine recipients of the grant, after Gorman, administrator of the program, verifies applicants' incomes and bank accounts to determine eligibility under federal low-income requirements.

A family is determined low-income under those guidelines if its liquid assets are assessed at \$10,000 or less and its gross income equals:

- A maximum \$7,650 for one person.
- \$8,775 for two persons.
- \$9,825 for three persons.
- \$10,950 for four persons.
- \$11,625 for five persons.
- \$12,300 for six persons.
- \$12,975 for seven persons.
- \$13,725 for eight persons.

After Gorman determines a family's financial eligibility, Thompson will inspect the family's home and estimate cost of the work needed to bring the home up to code.

Although the grant program is intended to remedy only building violations, such as plumbing, electrical wiring and heating deficiencies, Gorman said large families with inadequate space in their homes may obtain grants to construct an addition.

TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS, Gorman said, will recommend two or three contractors to grant recipients, after officials, advertise for bids to identify contractors with the lowest fees. Checks for the grants will be made to the homeowner.

Under the program, grant recipients must live in their homes for three years. (Continued on page 4A)

Auxiliary members will distribute information on pre-natal care, prevention of birth defects caused by rubella and a family immunization record.

Fair-goers may help Jaycee Auxiliary chapters throughout Michigan win their goal of an echo-cardiograph machine for Childrens Mott Hospital in Ann Arbor, promised by Gerber Co. If the chapters collect a sufficient number of Gerber Baby Food labels, a collection box will be placed at the fair.

## Massey will build in township

In an effort to remove the political stigma surrounding his expected relocation, Cadillac dealer Don Massey told the Observer & Eccentric he will develop his property in both Canton and Plymouth townships.

Presently located on Ann Arbor Road between Mill and Main streets in the City of Plymouth, Massey's dealership was at one

time expected to move to Canton.

Several months ago, after talking to a source close to Massey, the Observer & Eccentric reported the car dealer would be relocating to Plymouth Township, not Canton, because of Canton's stringent sign and berm requirements.

On Friday, Massey put an end to the speculation, saying he would develop his 10-acre site in Canton at the southwest corner of Lilley and Ford, and his property in

Plymouth Township at the southwest corner of I-275 and Ann Arbor Road.

"I'VE BEEN TALKING to Greenstein and I understand he's been getting a lot of flack about newspaper reports that I may not be locating in Canton. In my opinion, Greenstein is a man who meets up to his responsibilities and lives by them."

"I have no qualms whatsoever with him or the township."

There are things in the township's ordinances I don't like, but I respect the man for going by the book. I'd like to announce that I have every intention of developing my property in Canton," Massey said.

Republican campaign literature circulating in Canton faults Greenstein for losing Massey's business.

WHILE MASSEY has made it clear he intends to develop both sites, he said he is undecided about which will receive the Cadillac dealership.

"Obviously I'm not going to build two Cadillac dealerships, but I do intend to build two automobile dealerships—one in Canton and one in Plymouth Township."

Massey who originally housed a dual dealership of Oldsmobile and Cadillac at his present location, gave up the Oldsmobile line to increase his Cadillac business about four years ago.

"It's a common practice in metropolitan areas that dual dealers become exclusive in one line. We wanted to increase our Cadillac quota and we didn't have the facilities for both lines."

He said he will run only one dealership, either in Plymouth or Canton, and hopes to lease the other developed property to another dealer.

"I have no preference now as to which site I will choose for the Cadillac dealership," he said. "The other site will be developed on an investment basis."

Massey said his comments were not intended to be political.

"I sell cars to Democrats and Republicans alike and I don't know Mr. Greenstein's opponent in the primary, a Mr. Stein."

"I assume he's an honorable and capable man. But I have known Bob Greenstein for number of years and have found him to be very honorable and quite capable; Greenstein or the Canton Township administration has not hurt me or blocked me in any way and I am sorry for any problems which Greenstein may be facing because of rumors I intend to pull out of Canton."

"This is not and never has been the case," Massey said.

Massey's decision on location of the Cadillac dealership may be influenced by the Plymouth Township board.

THE CAR DEALER needs approval of his plans to rezone the Plymouth Township property from MR to C-2, a classification that allows car dealerships as a conditional use.

But that rezoning request, which has received recommended approval from the

# Millage drive starts; deadlines told

The citizens election committee has met to begin efforts for Thursday, Sept. 2, when Plymouth Community School District residents will vote again on the millage issue which lost by only one vote last June.

The committee met last Wednesday to plan elections to inform voters about the millage election. The difficulty of reaching parents, teachers, and other school supporters on the Thursday before Labor Day requires effort, according to co-chairpersons Joan Claeys and Sylvia Stetz.

The election campaign calendar includes

a meeting every Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. in the Board Office, 454 S. Harvey. Plymouth, of the citizens election committee. Anyone interested in assisting in the campaign is welcome to attend these meetings.

**LAST DAY TO REGISTER** to vote in the school election is August 3. The voter must be a resident of the Plymouth Community School District for 30 days prior to Sept. 2.

## Meeting set on guards

Officials from Plymouth Township will meet Aug. 9 with the Plymouth Board of Education to discuss the issue of sharing the expense for school crossing guards.

The school board Monday night agreed to meet with the township on that date after being requested by Plymouth Township Board for a joint meeting.

The meeting will begin at 6:30 p.m. in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High School. It will be open to the public and all interested residents may attend to listen to the discussion. The meeting, though, is not a public hearing but a gathering between the two governmental units, and so the audience will just be allowed to observe and listen to the discussion.

Two alternate dates were offered to Helen Richardson, Plymouth Township clerk, including the Monday, Aug. 9, date. She agreed Aug. 9 would be acceptable, says Board President Joe Gray.

Gray said Mrs. Richardson told him that it made no difference to her whether the meeting was open or closed. E.J. McClen-don commented it should be an open meeting with anyone in the community welcome to attend. "I see no reason to have anything but an open meeting," McClen-don added.

Board members agreed and the Aug. 9 date was approved.

Supt. John M. Hoben reported that he communicated the district's position and other information on three different occasions to Plymouth Township Supervisor J.D. McLaren—sending letters on Jan. 27, March 2, and May 13 of this year.

Hoben also spoke to a claim made by Frank Millington, township trustee, that the schools would soon receive an additional \$1.75 million by passage of House Bill 6065 and therefore would have plenty of money to pay for crossing guards.

Hoben told the board that HB6065 was a proposed bill which Plymouth Schools was lobbying for its passage to change distribution of Single Business Tax payments to be more equitable to school districts. That proposed bill, Hoben added, died in committee and there is no chance of it being resurrected this year. He communicated this information to Millington and Mrs. Richardson recently.

"I am hopeful that this will end this issue and that all parties will be knowledgeable as to the true position that now exists relative to this legislation and to our position relative to communications with the township concerning the crossing guard issue," Hoben said.

According to the ruling by the state elections office, voters may register for the school election on Aug. 3, even though there also is a primary election that day. Registrars for the City of Plymouth, Canton and Plymouth townships are available

at the board office to register residents to vote.

Absentee ballot applications are available now at the board office. Those who expect to be out of town Sept. 2 may obtain an application by telephoning 453-0200, ext.

422, or coming in person to 454 S. Harvey.

Absentee ballots will be available by Aug. 9. Residents who won't be able to vote in person Sept. 2 may vote at the board office between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday from Aug. 9 to Sept. 1.

Forestand Beier, administrative assistant for community relations, and Dr. Earl Hogan, assistant superintendent for instruction, attended the meeting for the school administration.

Voters will be asked to approve \$4.75 mills (\$4.75 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation) for operating for five years. It is the same millage question which was on the ballot last June.

# Reserve start depends on uniform arrival

Canton's embattled reserve police force may make its official debut in the township Wednesday at the Jaycee fair—if the rest of its uniforms arrive in the near future.

Presently, the reserves are fully equipped and ready to go with one exception—they have no pants.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein, who has been trying for the past several months to assure that the reserves will be on the street and working the five-day Jaycee fair, said all equipment has arrived with the exception of the uniform pants.

The reserves have completed 100 hours of classroom instruction at the Michigan Reserve Police Academy, and although final exams have been taken and most of the gun safety and handling tests have been completed, the actual number of students who passed is presently unknown.

"We were given to understand that a letter was mailed to us on Monday," Greenstein said late last week, "but we haven't received it yet."

"Our understanding is that all our people did quite well."

Official graduation ceremonies for the class are in September.

Canton has 30 students enrolled in the program.

Greenstein said the reserves have received an additional 50 hours of training, including private gun instruction from a certified National Rifle Association teacher and that 50 more extra hours of training, including first aid and heart attack aid, are slated in the near future.

He said of those who have, the results have been "staggering."

"EVERYONE THAT'S gone so far have passed and many have qualified as experts. Our top score was 960 (out of 1,000) and that's just amazing."

If the reserves are prepared to work at the fair, however, they will have to have board approval first, Greenstein said.

That would take a special meeting before the fair, something the supervisor has not yet requested.

"If the pants arrive, we will ask the board to approve our appointments," Greenstein explained. "But there's no sense in asking for a special meeting until we get the pants."

Greenstein said a meeting of the board

and the township planning commission has already been scheduled for Aug. 4 and if needed, a special meeting of the board can be requested at that time.

The supervisor said he will also make pay suggestions at the time he recommends the names of the reserves to the board.

"I'LL ASK THE board to confirm the names of the officers we submit, and I'll also ask that the reserves get the minimum wage."

Presently the minimum wage is \$2.20 an hour. At that rate, the estimated cost of the reserves would about \$50 a night.

The supervisor said he hopes to have four reserves working each night from 6-11 p.m.

But he cautioned, "I think they'll turn down the pay. Most of them I've talked to said they won't accept the pay."

Greenstein said if the board approves the wages, it will be up to each individual reserve to either accept or reject the pay.

"If they do choose to accept the pay, about all it will cover will be their uniform maintenance and cleaning, which they have to pay for, and their gas," Greenstein said.

# Contracts show increase

Members of the Canton DPW and building and fire departments are working under their first union contracts.

The contracts, recently ratified by the Canton Board of Trustees and members of Local 2289 of the International Association of Firefighters (AFL-CIO) and members of the International Union of American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), representatives of the township building and DPW departments, provide for increased wages, increased medical insurance coverage and other fringe benefits.

The firefighter's contract, retroactive to Jan. 1, 1976 with an expiration date of Dec. 31, 1977, provides for a 6 per cent pay increase the first year, and an additional four per cent increase the second.

The contract provides for a scale of salaries ranging from \$8,750 for newly-hired cadets to \$18,466 for captains the first year. Salaries during the contract's second year range from \$9,000 to \$19,139.

The salaries are based on a 56-hour work week and a three-platoon system. Under the contract, firefighters will receive overtime pay of \$4.50 an hour and \$8 per run.

six firefighters must be on duty at all times.

The firefighters' contract, as well as the DPW's and building department's, also provides for longevity pay, a new benefit.

Under the contracts, employees are entitled to \$60 longevity pay after three years and an additional \$20 each year to a maximum \$360.

In addition, the contracts add master medical, a \$2 prescription plan and an optical program to the employees' Blue Cross-Blue Shield policies.

The optical program, available to all township employees, provides for a free eye examination and free pair of glasses each year to each employee and all members of his family. Under the program, em-

ployees must receive eye examinations at specified clinics.

The three-year contract for DPW and building department workers, effective April 1 of this year, provides for a 50-cent-an-hour increase the first year, a 25-cent increase the second and a 25-cent increase the third.

The contract provides for a meal allowance of \$3.50, if employees work a specified number of overtime hours. In addition, the contract provides DPW workers with fatigue time, a new benefit, if they work more than 1½ shifts in a 24-hour period.

A committee composed of AFSCME and township officials, will meet monthly to submit safety recommendations to the township and union.

# Trustee quits Wayne-Westland board

In resigning his post as a Wayne-Westland Board of Education member, William White admits confusion both about his effectiveness as a trustee and the reaction to his resignation.

White, a Lutheran minister, will be leaving his job as director of a camping program for his church, to begin a small church in Mt. Pleasant in October.

Perhaps the most outspoken member of the board, White candidly admits he's puzzled about his own effectiveness and "more confused than pleased" about the letters and phone calls he's received from Wayne-Westland residents.

"It puzzles me that when there is such tremendous public apathy, I should be getting calls and letters. The only persons who come out for board meetings are the press and the district's staff."

"I'm totally surprised. I've had virtually no feedback on anything I've said or done in three years as a board member. When I ran for election I had a lot of support and after that I didn't know whether or not I was shooting in the dark."

WHITE WAS JUST ASKING of himself and the district as he was of the taxpayers.

"I don't know what we've achieved," he said. "In the first place it's a bureaucracy and so blooming slow to change. It also

takes four votes to get anything done. I guess I see myself as different from the rest of the board."

"There are some things that I hoped for that haven't happened. I don't think we've developed choices for people."

"We have one form of education at one school and a second at another. There's only one school—Jackson—where there are different styles of learning. At Jackson there are self-contained classrooms with the more traditional teaching, individualized teaching and the team approach. Our goal is to be able to offer choices to all."

White's main criticism of the district and the board is their "orientation" toward business matters.

"It's not that they're not important, but take a look at the amount of time spent on labor relations, and the budget and compare it with the amount of time spent on curriculum items."

"I've been trying since February to get the intramural program tacked on to the end of a study session agenda."

"I fear that public education is going to be swallowed up by the same minds we have in business and industry who measure schools by their 'success' and their testing."

"The district refers to its systems as 'highly sophisticated. I would use 'complex.' And when it gets to be complex, we're in danger."

a board meeting? It's the whole humanizing process I'm concerned with."

"I'm convinced that new programs are needed more for the teachers to keep them interested. I think kids would settle for a solid program and a teacher who could convey it to them. But like business and industry, we're concerned with new products."

WHITE WAS ALSO complimentary to the district and its employees.

"The three years were a lot of fun," White said. "I was working with people who were caring and humane."

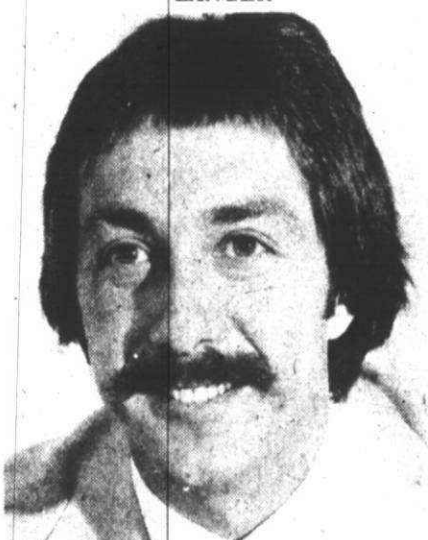

For years The Stroller has made it a cus-  
tom to hide himself into a corner, slump  
down in an easy chair, and take stock  
account of himself. It is much like a large

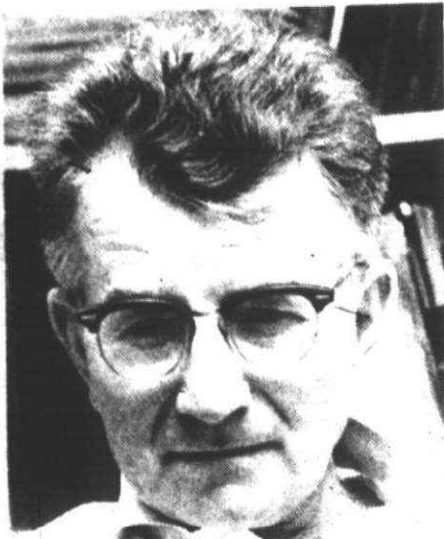
Guenther pursues Plymouth vision

One of the most dedicated disciples of the old adage, "The future belongs to those who prepare for it," can be found in Harold Guenther, the Plymouth industrialist who recently announced plans to convert the old brick building on North Main Street into a modern restaurant mall with the added possibility that there also would be a summer theater on the premises.

"The only hope for the future of Plymouth," the former mayor and city commissioner said, "is to develop unusual businesses and shops that will attract people from all sections and put the city on the map again."

THERE WAS A time when Plymouth was known around the globe," he further explained, "when the Daisy Air Rifle was manufactured here. Shipments were made to virtually every country in the world. This stopped when the Daisy Company was moved to Arkansas, and now we must do something to bring back that sort of attention."

He quickly pointed out that inasmuch as the city contains only two square miles, there is no room to develop an industrial base.

"So we have to turn to business. And I am hoping that in the proposed mall we will have the type of shops that advertise in national magazines and attract people—and mail—to us."

In the midst of his explanation for the latest move, Guenther, who has had a guiding hand in many modern developments in the area, smiled and said:

"On our recent trip to Williamsburg, Va., Mrs. Guenther talked me into going miles off the beaten path just to pick up an article she saw advertised in one of the specialty magazines. We could have such things right here in our city."

WHILE THE OVERALL plans for the conversion of the north Main Street property call for a summer theater, Guenther has no desire to go into the theater business.

"I will if I have to," he said, "but the theater is not my business. It would be a tremendous asset, however, and there will be every effort to have it in operation with about a 400-seat capacity."

Under the proposed plan, the old three-story brick building will be gutted and the entire interior rebuilt, with the second and third floors as specialty shops.

The architects have been instructed to draw up plans for such things as a circular stairway and provide for an elevator and deft use of plants and shrubbery. The exterior of the building, that once housed the old Markham Rifle Company, will be sandblasted and given an entirely new appearance.

This development, while only a dream at the moment, is designed to be realized within two years and is the latest in the Guenther ventures that have helped to make the city more attractive.

A LONG-TIME friend of the retarded and handicapped, Guenther's manufacturing plant has specialized in equipment that will aid the unfortunate to move about. These include special chairs and poles that help them keep balance while walking. And he has worked closely with hospitals in designing special equipment.

In this desire to help the unfortunate he was a guiding hand in obtaining the center for retarded and handicapped persons on the corner of Wing and Deering Street.

For years the former mayor has exercised a zealous desire to improve the city and help the needy.

His handiwork was seen on Main Street as a silent partner in establishing the John Smith Clothing Store and its improvements.

Among other things was his work with the Rotary Club in establishing the fountain in Kellogg Park and the special bricks in the pavement.

Another project in which he had a hand was the establishment of the First National Bank of Plymouth, and he also has played a major role in the activity at the Historical Museum where he serves on the board of directors.

Behind the scenes he has been a diligent worker. It was his work with a special committee that enabled the Rotary Club to establish a kidney dialysis unit at St. Mary Hospital. And it was Guenther who headed the Rotary committee that had the famed mural installed in the Historical Museum.

At the moment, he is working on a year-long program for the aging that now is being undertaken by the Rotary Club.

Always on the move—and looking for more things to do—he had a hand in modernizing Old Village by renovating two old buildings and turning them into apartment houses.

Another of his bits of handiwork is the monument between city hall and the Dunning Library that contains the bit of rock taken from the dock in Plymouth, Eng-

land, from which the Mayflower sailed in 1620.

WHEN HIS TERM as a city commissioner ended a year ago and he refused to run for re-election, he said, "I think I can do more good on the outside than I can sitting at the commission table."

In the months that followed, he has proven the truth of his statement. Now he has another bit of philosophy.

"I'd like to retire from business," he said, "turn the plant over to my boys, and spend the rest of my days just helping to make the City of Plymouth so attractive—both in appearance and business—that it again will be known around the world."

And if past pe performances are a basis by which to judge, he will make that possible.

## Vettese girls seek state title

Lav Vay led off with a single. Sandy Magdowski followed with another base hit, and Jan Breunhant singled to load the bases. Cunningham walked to make it 4-2, and Sue Myrtle hit into a fielder's choice to narrow the margin to 4-3.

Moments later Barb Smith slammed a three-run homer to climax the uprising and she was named the most valuable player of the tournament after the game.

One of the stronger aspects of the team's play is its defense which turned six double plays in the tourney, and four twin-killings in one game, earlier in the season. In slo-pitch softball the standard for hitting excellence is .600. Vettese has seven players above that plateau which shows their hitting ability.

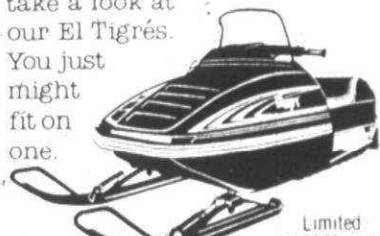

# The Pocket

The metropolitan area, long recognized as the bowling capital of the world, has strengthened its claim to the title with the membership figures released this week by Tom Mc Kay, executive secretary of the Greater Detroit Bowling Association.

As the official year of ABC record-keeping closed, the area boasted a membership of 138,780 that competed in 3290 leagues.

This is compared to a membership of 135,837 in 3233 leagues a year ago. This shows, too, an increase of more than 3,000 members and puts Detroit into the category of generating more enthusiasm than any other area in the country.

"These figures are for our winter leagues," Mc Kay explained, "and when we get the final total of summer leagues and their membership, we will go way over the top."

With the men having a new high mark and the Detroit Women's Bowling Association coming in with 115,000, it means that the Detroit area has a membership of a quarter million adult sanctioned bowlers.

Checking with the Michigan Youth Bowling Association, it was learned that it has a membership of 37,160. This also is one of the largest youth delegations in the country.

Putting that together, it is certain that Detroit is entitled to the title "The Bowling Capital of the World."

**THE BOWLING PROPRIETORS** All-Star mixed league, now in its 10th week, is more than making good the opinion that it has helped to keep up interest in top leagues during the summer months.

Over the first 10 weeks, the men's portion of the circuit has averaged 190 and the women had combined for a 180 average.

The women have shown their ability to keep pace and the latest example came last Wednesday night at Merri-Bowl when Mary Kilgore, of the Motown team, rolled a 253 single in a 607 series to pace the entire loop. She missed a No. 7 pin and lost a chance for another 700 series.

While Mary was knocking them over Tom Mc Kay was showing that secretaries can score well, too. He had a single of 232 in a 650 series.

As the schedule nears its end, all hands favor the return of the league next summer.

**WHILE THE** membership of the bowlers association is on the upswing, the proprietors association also is moving right along with a series of new establishments about to open for the fall and winter season.

Among the new sites will be Superior Bowl in Canton Township. This is a 40-lane establishment and is bound to lure many newcomers into the game.

Another of the new houses will be the Taylor Lanes in Taylor, Michigan. This will be a 50-lane layout in what is considered a 'live' area.

To give you some idea of the spread of bowling across the state, the Bowling Pro-

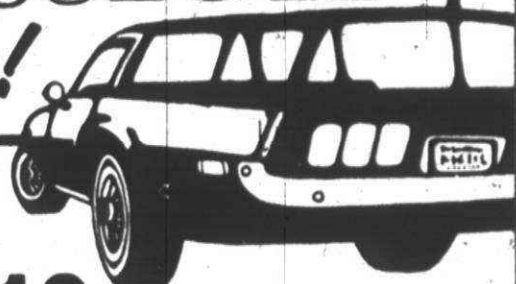
prietors of Michigan now boasts a membership of 312 establishments with 6,728 lanes. Of this amount, 111 houses with 2800 beds are members of the Greater Detroit Bowling Proprietors Association.

It doesn't require a great mathematician to figure out how many games are bowled in a season when it is figured that a proprietor must average about four leagues daily to keep his head up in the financial waters.

**HERE'S ONE** to put in your scrap book. When one of the women bowlers in the all-star mix league fell to a 123 game after starting with counts 170 and 195, she complained that her thumb swelled "and we were bowling right at the main entrance and the humidity was terrible after the rain storm."

That belongs at the top of the list.

# Start sewing now for Festival costume

You don't need an early American ancestor to enjoy wearing a colonial creation of 1776. At the 1976 Fall Festival you can adorn yourself in the style of Martha Washington, Betsy Ross, Thomas Jefferson and a host of other bicentennial favorites.

The fashions of '76 have been re-created by American pattern companies. Residents will want to begin sewing right away to be prepared for the Plymouth Fall Festival costume competition in September. With careful selection of fabric and trimming, the home seamstress can be the envy of Lady Baltimore's dressmaker. Here are just a few of the many patterns available.

## WATTEAU OVERDRESS

Colonial portraits have familiarized us with this handsome gown of the mid-century. The low-cut, long pointed bodice and full-extended skirt remained the fashion for the greater part of the 18th century. The wattleau overdress was usually worn long, falling to the floor. Costumes were made of flowered silk and brocade, muslins, dimities and other dainty fabrics with the use of lace about the neck and sleeves. (Simplicity pattern 6787)

## FOR LASSIES

Young girls wore dresses similar to their mothers. A simpler dress would not include the long wattleau overdress that was used for formal wear. The little cap remained in high favor from colonial times through the greater part of the 18th century. It was made of dainty lace and gauze. (Simplicity 6828)

## TRI-COAT

A typical male outfit for 1776 included the long tri-coat with a curved front, a vest and shirt with lacy jabot, and breeches buttoned just below the knee. Co-

lonial men generally wore low-buckled shoes and silk stockings. Buttons were either fabric covered or made of brass or horn.

**THE COSTUME** competition is sponsored by the Plymouth branch of the American Association of University Women. Judging will be from 1:15 to 2:15 p.m. behind the bandstand in Kellogg Park on Sunday, Sept. 12. First, second and third place cash prizes will be awarded with winners announced at 3 p.m.

Authentic costumes or a good reproduction are required for the fashion competition which covers the period from 1776 to 1915. Costumes must be complete in detail except for the footwear.

Categories include: Family, two or more related persons; children, up to age 14; and adult, age 15 and older.

Authentic costumes and reproductions will be judged separately.

## She rode to altar but stood to speak vows

Cynthia Lentovich wasn't able to fulfill a dream of eight years, but it really didn't matter a bit when she became the bride of Tom Russette.

Although this Redford Township resident had been determined, ever since a trampoline fall in 1968 consigned her to life in a wheelchair, that on her wedding day she would at least walk up the church aisle to greet her bridegroom.

She took a few steps toward the altar of Unity Church of Livonia, but then faltered and went the rest of the way in her wheelchair. Then she stood beside Tom during part of the ceremony as they repeated their vows before the Rev. Gene Sorensen.

And no bride walking down the aisle could have been more radiant.

"SHE WASN'T at all upset," her mother, Genevieve Lentovich, said later. "She tried, she really tried. And she had

told us before to have her wheelchair handy."

After the wheelchair had been pushed back to the church entrance, she and her husband were ready for a ride to their reception in the Farmington Hills Knights of Columbus Hall in a vintage Ford restored by Cindy's brother, Mitchell.

Cindy's accomplishments leading up to her wedding day are the story of what determination can do to conquer adversity, and she expects to continue with an active life, combining the roles of student and homemaker and going on with a fight for a community that recognizes the rights of the handicapped.

A fall on a gymnasium trampoline when she was a senior at Clarenceville High School put her in a hospital for five months. She realized in that period that her neck injury was permanent, but she started Schoolcraft College a few months later. She earned an associate degree and began work at Redford Community Hospi-

tal's insurance office.

Now she is a student at Eastern Michigan University, planning to complete a degree in social work in December, 1977.

**CINDY HAS BEEN ACTIVE** in the Mobility Awareness Team, a group organized to help governments and people become more aware to the needs of the handicapped, and has participated in wheelchair sports, including javelin, discus and table tennis.

She also has taken a leadership role in the Coalition for Barrier-Free Design, and probably will be attending a meeting of that group in Lansing soon after she and Tom return from their Toronto and Niagara Falls honeymoon.

The couple chose Unity Church for their wedding because it has a short aisle and is equipped with ramps so friends in wheelchairs could attend.

Pushing that kind of planning in public buildings is one of the main purposes of

the Coalition for Barrier-Free Design, Cindy said.

**SHE AND TOM** will live in a home so equipped because it formerly was occupied by the John Lentovich family.

They met at a Halloween party last year.

"I went as the Jolly Green Giant and he

wore my sprout hat around," Cindy said.

"After we got talking, we found we lived just two blocks apart in Redford Township."

The two are planning to give their own Halloween party this year. Tom is employed by Simon Sales Import Co. in Madison Heights.

The wedding reception featured a cake four feet long, two feet wide and five feet tall, fashioned by Richard Holloway, a Northville baker who is a longtime friend of the Lentovich family.

Its decorations included a bride, a fountain and a doll cake for each of Cindy's six attendants.

## Alcohol problem growing, says St. Mary director

Out of 318 hospitals surveyed in the midwest 27 per cent of the male patients had alcohol problems, as well as nine per cent

of the women, says Frank MacDonell, director of the Alcohol Treatment Division of St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.

"In the army, everyone is an alcoholic. There are bars on the hospital windows because of the men suffering from the DT's. Alcoholics are resistant to anesthesia and it is very obvious when you have one on the table," says Dr. Richard Horsch, chief of staff.

Liquor is served in army hospitals with the meals because of the demand, he says. Generals, colonels right on down are affected.

"There is a loss of innocence among junior high students. A high percentage of them have had first hand experience with alcohol themselves," says Charles Bethea, clinic coordinator.

"Each time we go into schools, there are kids withdrawing from alcohol and the parents say, 'Thank God they're not smoking pot,'" says MacDonell.

When schools start, MacDonell warns people to take a look at the parking lot which is usually littered with beer cans and wine bottles.

"I know a store where they have to back up against the wine shelf so the kids won't steal the wine on their breaks from classes," he says.

Babies are born of alcoholic mothers and are also addicted, says one doctor.

"Scary" Incomprehensible "Or is all this striking a familiar chord."

OUR SOCIETY REVOLVES AROUND DRINKING, says MacDonell. There are even dresses made in which to drink in, "cocktail dresses."

"There is a tremendous social pressure to drink and a lot of people have found that they have had to make the choice between maintaining friendships or staying sober," says Bethea.

"The people we come across think that they work better when they're drunk. In Detroit, people are keeping up high levels of alcohol in their bloodstreams when they go to work in the factories," says MacDonell.

What is alcoholism? Medically it is a disease, says Bethea. He compared it to an allergy.

"A normal person may need two or three drinks to get a certain effect. The difference is in time the alcoholic is going to have to drink more to get the same effect," he says.

Medically their body is resisting the effects of the alcohol and they must progress to maybe three drinks, he says.

Comparing alcoholism to diabetes, he says that the problem drinker who is drinking for emotional relief may be like the person who goes on an eating binge and eats primarily sweets when under stress. Too many sweets may cause the allergy (diabetes) and too much alcohol may cause alcoholism.

"The factors involved include how the person reacts physiologically to alcohol or sweets, the psychological stress involved and the social components," says Bethea.

While many people drink, less than ten per cent develop the psychological and physiological dependency that can be categorized as alcoholism, according to the National Council on Alcoholism.

"Increasing tolerance and major withdrawal are the symptoms that best describe the alcoholic," says MacDonell.

Animal data suggests that anyone who drinks enough over a sufficiently long period of time will develop signs of alcoholism, says the Council.

"Children of alcoholic parents have a 35 per cent chance of becoming alcoholic. There may possibly be some genetic transformation. Some people are extremely tolerant to alcohol at the first incident," says MacDonell.

EVEN THOUGH THERE IS A STRONG genetic base, all the medical facts are not known according to Bethea.

In studies with rats, alcoholism which has been induced in the parents has been passed on to future generations. The percentage of alcoholic rats is much higher than in the original non-alcoholic families, he says.

"In Sweden a study was done after 200 youngsters were removed from alcoholic homes before the age of six months. 30 per cent of these youngsters became alcoholics which proves the 1 in 3 ratio," according to Bethea. According to the Council, persons at a high risk of alcoholism may include:

- A family history of alcoholism, including parents, siblings, grandparents, uncles and aunts.

- A history of teetotalism in the family, particularly where strong moral overtones were present and, most particularly where the social environment of the patient has changed to associations in which drinking is encouraged or required.

- A history of alcoholism or teetotalism in the spouse or the family of the spouse.

- Coming from a broken home or home with much parental discord, particularly where the father was absent or rejecting, not punitive.

- Being the last child of a large family or in the last half of the sibship in a large family.

- Although some cultural groups (for example, the Irish and Scandinavians) have been recorded as having a higher incidence of alcoholism than others (Jews, Chinese and Italians) alcoholism can occur in people of any cultural derivation.

- Having female relatives of more than one generation who have had a high incidence of recurrent depressions.

- Heavy smoking: heavy drinking is often associated with heavy smoking, but the reverse need not be true.

- Since alcoholism is relapsing and chronic, there are few alcoholics who claim a complete cure, says the Council.

- "Sobriety, working through problems and dieting are the best ways to deal with alcoholism," says Bethea.

- "I don't know a single true alcoholic who can return to social drinking," he says.

# Renault's mini-car available in U.S.

The original 40-miles-per-gallon mini-car, proven by more than two years of on-road operation, Renault 5, is available in two versions for the American market.

Nearly one million of the three-door hatchbacks have been produced and sold in Europe since 1973, headed by France, where the car originated and where this one model occupies 10.3 per cent of the market at present.

Renault 5 went on sale in the United States Feb. 1 in both a basic 5TL version and a more luxurious 5GTL version, which offer options that allow the motorist to tailor the car to his own taste.

THE U.S. VERSIONS of the mini-car combines perky styling and passenger comfort with economy operation and useful performance.

Renault 5 mini-car can be seen at Bill Hermann Renault, 31151 West Ten Mile Road, in Farmington.

Renault 5's origins and basic approach to motoring are plainly Gallic, but the improved package and performance levels are designed specifically to meet the special demands of the American driver.

The car's basic design is a spacious, unitized box with its four wheels at the corners for stability under demanding driving. While Renault 5 has the shortest overall length of any major mini-car, it also has the longest wheelbase.

THROUGH USE of double-acting hydraulic telescopic shock absorbers front and rear, couple

with independent, unequal-length control arms and independent trailing arms, the car has ride characteristics of a larger and heavier machine.

The car appears to roll gently on sharp turns when viewed from outside, but inside the ride is smooth and effortless, and full adhesion to the road surface is never broken.

For the U.S. market, with its special emission-control demands and extra weight brought about by safety requirements, Renault 5 has been equipped with a front-mounted, longitudinally positioned four-cylinder engine of 1,289 cubic centimeters (78.66 cubic inches).

It is an in-line, overhead valve engine with removable wet cylinder sleeves. Dual-barrel Weber carburetors are fitted on both versions of the car.

IN STOCK FORM at 6,000 r.p.m., the engine is rated at 58 horsepower, which can drive the 1,819 pound (curb weight) car almost 90 miles per hour in top gear. For most economical performance, a floor-mounted, tight-gate all-synchromesh manual four-speed shift is standard.

Renault 5, running on regular or low-lead regular fuel (no-lead in California), is EPA-rated at 40-miles per gallon in the country, 28 in the city, and 32 m.p.g. average based on 55 per cent country/45 per cent city driving situations. A U.S. gallon (3.785 liter) fuel tank is standard.

Dual hydraulic brakes are standard on Renault 5, discs in front, with self-adjusting full floating calipers, and drums in the rear.
