Recount requested

Treasurer Carl Parsell, loser to Anna Bradley in Aug. 3 primary Wednesday filed for a recount with Canton Clerk John Flodin.

Unofficial results had Parsell a loser by about 90 votes, but when the township board of canvassers convened Aug. 5, they discovered an addition error in the tallying of results from the nine precincts and the absentee ballots that reduced the margin to 59 votes.

The adding error, Flodin said, had nothing to do with readouts from the voting machines.

Parsell said the reason for the recount had nothing to do with the addition error.

"I asked for it because I couldn't rationalize the difference between the number of people who went to the polls and the num-

ber of people who voted for the treasurer's office.

"No doubt it will come out the same way, but I did want to see a recount."

Parsell said about 500 people who cast ballots didn't vote in the treasurer's race, which also featured Republican Bart Berg, who was uncontested in the primary.

FLODIN, CLERK for 20 years, said it was the first recount in the township during his tenure.

"I really don't know how long it will take, but I imagine it will be at least another two weeks."

Flodin said he took the recount request to the Wayne County Clerk's office Wednesday, just before the deadline.

He said nothing can be done until the

state canvasses the election even though the county and Canton have already certified the results.

Flodin said the size of the margin probably was large enough that a recount would not change the outcome.

"I have faith the system is sound," he said. "I have a tendency to doubt there's been an error."

Flodin said when the state is done canvassing the election, the county will conduct the recount and until then nothing can be done.

"The machines will stay sealed until the county is ready," he said.

Flodin said he was unsure if the recount was mandatory or if the county had a right to challenge Parsell's request.

UNOFFICIAL estimates from the county put the price of the recount at between \$400 and \$600, Flodin said.

The township will be billed that amount, minus the filing fee Parsell was forced to pay.

Candidates seeking a recount must pay \$5 a precinct—in Canton's case \$50, for nine voting precincts, and a 10th set up to count absentee ballots.

"The people I talked to at the county were not exactly sure what it would cost and all they could give me was a rough estimate, but the cost is sure to exceed \$50," Flodin said.

Body found in Fellows Creek

Wayne County Sheriff's detectives are investigating the possibility of murder in the Fellow's Creek subdivision after a body was discovered late Friday morning.

Sheriff's deputies, responding to a call, found the nude body of a young white male in his early 20s at the home of Gregory Waters, 44528 Whitman.

The subdivision is located just south of Ford Road on Sheldon.

Detectives handling the case said the man, dead for two days, was found lying face down on the bed with a plastic bag tied around his head.

Detectives reported they could not identify the body because of decomposition, but added they were "going on the presumption it's murder."

While Sheriff's spokesmen refused to say the dead man was Waters, it was Waters'

absence from work that prompted the investigation.

Waters, a draftsman for the Jarvis Company, had not been seen in two days by his employer.

On Friday, his employer visited the house in search of Waters, police reported.

The employer then called the sheriff because "he noticed some unusual things around the house," detectives said.

Newspapers had been piled up and Waters' car was parked in the driveway.

Neighbors told police Waters always parked his car in his garage.

Detectives handling the case said neighbors didn't notice anything else unusual.

Police are waiting for an autopsy to determine cause of death.

Police said Waters lived alone.

Parsell's job jeopardized at POAM over reserves

Carl Parsell, who lost his job as Canton's treasurer in the Aug. 3 primary, may be in jeopardy of losing a second job, his full-time position as executive director of the Police Officer's Association of Michigan.

On Friday, the 19-member executive board of POAM will discuss alleged conflict of interest charges raised against Parsell by fellow officers.

The charges stem from Parsell's endorsement and active participation in establishing a fully armed paid reserve police force in Canton—possibly one of the reasons he lost in the primary.

Perhaps the hottest issue of the election, Parsell and two other incumbents who favored the reserves, Supervisor Robert Greenstein and Trustee Gerald Cheske were ousted by a slate of candidates who were against arming a reserve force or using it for anything more than crowd control and traffic direction at school and township functions.

THE KEY TO the conflict of interest charge is that Parsell has betrayed police unions by voting for a reserve force in Canton that may take away police jobs.

Parsell said he there is no conflict of interest, although the matter has caused him considerable problems.

He implied some of the problems may be political, and cited two Canton figures and a Plymouth officer as among those who called to register complaints with members of the executive board.

Parsell said Gene Daley, a successful candidate for trustee, and a running mate of Anna Bradley, the woman who defeated him in the primary, had called, as had Bruce Young, a man with whom Parsell, and other members of the Greenstein slate had publicly argued with on several occasions.

Parsell said Carl Berry, a sergeant detective in Plymouth and a man he had previous run-ins with, had also called.

Daley, a lieutenant with the Wayne County Sheriff, denied he had made any calls, while Young refused comment.

Berry said he had called because he felt Parsell owed some answers to professional police officers in Michigan.

"I THINK HE'S in conflict. Either he represents me as an officer or he doesn't. There's nothing personal about this and I don't want to see the man fired—it's just that I think he owes us an explanation."

"Carl's done one hell of a good job and I don't hate to see us lose his expertise, but I don't see how he justifies what he's done."

"But if he can come up with a reasonable explanation, I'll stand up there right next to him."

Berry said the board members he had called, although he refused to specify who and how many, had already been called by

others and knew more "inside information" than Berry did.

CANTON IS A very unusual situation," Parsell explained, "and the reserves are the only way to get badly needed police protection."

"We're in the middle of a court suit with Wayne County and the sheriff that has statewide significance, and although we need a police department, we can't start one until the state supreme court rules."

"The sheriff's union already has a contract with the county for 28 men in Canton and the other six townships and what we do doesn't jeopardize their contract."

While others have said the POAM stance is firmly against reserve units, Parsell said each case must be judged on its merits.

"I'm against reserves taking away police jobs, but that's not the case. There's just no other way we could go here."

Canton and six other townships, Van Buren, Plymouth, Northville, Sumpter, Huron and Brownstown are appealing a case to the Supreme Court requesting Wayne County be forced to continue funding the sheriff's road patrol in unincorporated areas of the county.

The county has balked at footing the entire bill and has asked the townships to contribute to payment of the road patrol.

"I've spent 26 years in the police field and 12 in the union field and I don't think I've ever worn the company hat. I've done my job fairly," Parsell said.

"Over the years, I've taken some hard stands. I haven't chosen to make friends—I've tried to do what's right, and along the way I've made some enemies."

Parsell said executive board members had been called on several occasions, before the reserve was created, to influence Parsell's vote in Canton on the matter, and afterwards, to complain of his position.

Parsell, who is an employee of POAM, subject to its board approval, said, "they can call up and cause me all kinds of problems and if they find a conflict of interest and it comes to a parting of the ways, so be it."

LEOPOLD KOZUH, vice-president of POAM, said the four officers of the association would prepare a report at their meeting today to present to the full executive board Friday. He said Harold Kunkle, president of the association was also preparing a report.

Kozuh said he became aware of the matter from newspaper accounts and had not been called. He said the matter came up before the board at its monthly meeting in July.

Carl is employed by the executive board and has a contract with them which can be broken. I don't know what the board will do—or what the reports will show."

Greenstein charges

Reserves victims of harassment

Canton Township Supervisor Robert Greenstein claims that the daytime employers of many Canton police reserves have been called by "political opponents of

our slate" and told their employees were moonlighting as a reserve officers.

In addition, Greenstein charges that Inkster Patrolman Larry McEwen—who is teaching law enforcement to reserve officers "for no pay" after work—was a victim of dirty tricks.

According to McEwen, a number of calls were made to his police station in which the caller stated that McEwen was earning \$2.80 an hour by working on the Canton police reserve force.

In one instance, McEwen says the caller identified himself as Lt. Richard Cook of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department.

COOK READILY admits that he worked at the polls for Greenstein's opponent, Harold Stein, but says Greenstein and his supporters "clutching for straws" with the recent allegation.

"It wasn't me—no way," said Cook. "I don't know where he (Greenstein) got his information."

Cook says he became involved in the recent supervisor campaign because he opposes Greenstein's concept of a police reserve force acting independently with full police powers.

Training is my bag," said Cook. "And I know the worst thing

you can do is put two rookies together in a car without an experienced officer. At least five years experience on the street is necessary for one of the men in the car."

"As well-intentioned as the reserves may feel, you're putting him in a scout car with a pistol and he's going to react when he sees something. I'm saying don't let them do full-blown police work."

Cook emphasized that he was speaking as a Canton citizen, not a representative of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and asked

He said he has no objection to McEwen's schooling the Canton reserves, "if that's his choice."

"If there's no rules and regulations against that in his department, it's his choice. I don't know, someone may have called Inkster. But it wasn't me."

INKSTER POLICE CHIEF Henry Jason said he was aware that McEwen was working with the Canton reserves "strictly as an instructor."

"He has the academic achievement allowing him to teach law enforcement," said Jason. "As long as it doesn't involve police work and there's no money involved, there's no problem."

Jason said he knows of no phoned com-

plaints of McEwen's volunteer work with the Canton officers.

"Nobody made a complaint to my knowledge," the chief stated. "Nothing's come across my desk."

Greenstein says the McEwen case is but one of many complaints, mostly anonymous calls made to reserve volunteers and their employers.

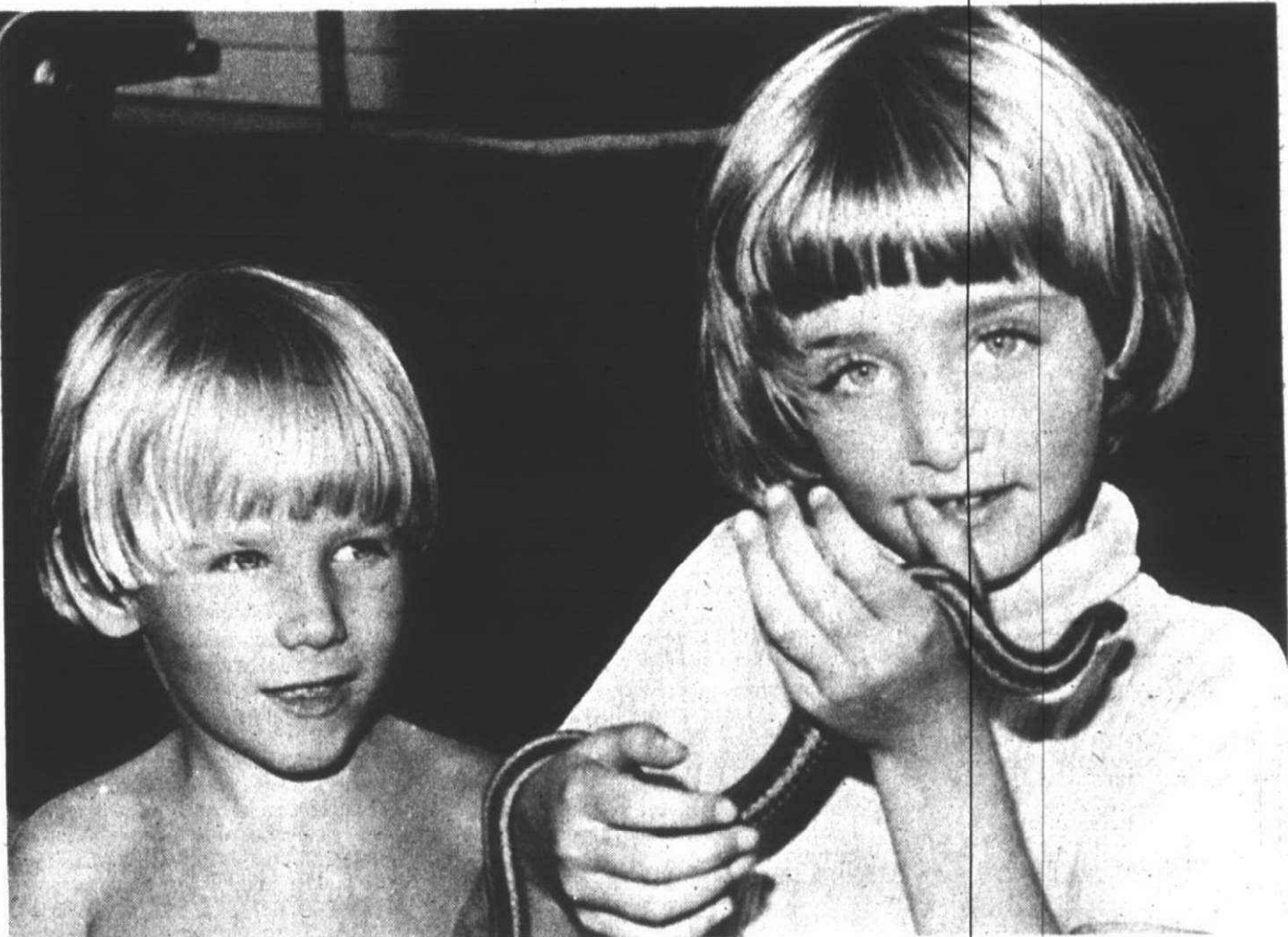
Carl Silvers, volunteer commander of the Canton reserves, also worked as a federal postal agent. He discovered that his inspector had been called and told that Silvers was moonlighting, according to Greenstein.

"CARL HAS filed an injunction with the government charging interference with his civil rights," Greenstein said.

Greenstein says he hopes many more reserves and volunteers will take legal action to uncover who was behind the phone calls which he calls a "vicious, political attempt to jeopardize these men's jobs."

A Ford employee who works as a reserve is now being asked to report to work at odd shifts, after his boss received a phone tip, Greenstein claims.

"We've been sucking gut punches from these people too long," Greenstein said.

Foust quits CAC

Brian Foust, recording secretary of the Citizen's Advisory Council told the Canton Township Board Tuesday he was resigning his position because the CAC "was a puppet committee of one member of our township board, Mr. (Supervisor Robert) Greenstein."

Foust, in his statement, made reference to alleged campaign harassment and said Greenstein had been secretly screening prospective members of the citizen organization.

"I have been a board-appointed member of the Canton Citizen's Advisory Council since its inception in Sept. 1975. Since then I have encountered many difficulties working with our intermediary, Mr. Greenstein, and his office on CAC related matters."

"I have worked hard as an active member and officer of the CAC. I am proud of our accomplishments despite the various impediments we have encountered. It is indeed most frustrating."

Foust said he would recommend his subdivision not select a replacement for him "until the CAC becomes a truly representative group or until Mr. Greenstein leaves office this fall, whichever occurs first."

IN A PARTING shot, Foust added, "Thank you for enlightening me to the

meaning of the democracy in our township government."

In the waning days of the primary campaign, Foust claimed he was the victim of threatening phone calls and that his automobile tires were deflated on several occasions.

Foust said the dirty tricks must have been the work of Greenstein or his campaign workers because they occurred prior to printed accounts of his screening accusations.

"These calls were obviously coming from Mr. Greenstein's campaign workers because all our communications were in written form between his office and myself plus the copies I sent to all the board members."

Greenstein said the accusations were lies. Of the screening charge that he had personally stopped potential appointments from the CAC without board consent, he said, "I swear on the life of my children that those appointments were not from the CAC but personal suggestions by Mr. Foust."

"They were not voted on by the CAC, but arranged by Foust and another cohort," Greenstein said.

"I'll tell you right now, you've received all the cooperation you could get."

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


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Kindergarten testing debated

Children entering kindergarten classes in the Plymouth Community School District this fall will undergo assessment testing to determine their level of maturity and readiness for school.

The testing program, now in its second year, last week escaped the budgetary axe of school board members, who unanimously voted to continue the program this year and directed the district's administration to determine the program's timetable.

School officials estimate cost of the pro-

gram at \$3,500, if the testing is held after school begins. The cost is estimated from \$3,500 to \$7,000, if kindergartners take the tests before classes begin in September.

The district's budget "E," formulated in case next month's request for 4.75 mills (\$4.75 per \$1,000 state equalized value) fails as it did last spring, allocates \$3,700 for the program.

But at least one board member at last week's meeting spoke in favor of scheduling the testing program before classes begin in the fall.

IF THE TESTS are conducted after classes begin as they were last year, noted Trustee Marcia Borowski, the majority of kindergartners are left with substitutes during the first week of classes, while their teacher conducts assessment tests with other pupils on an individual basis.

"It would make a lot of sense to do this before the year begins," said Mrs. Borowski. "The testing is mainly done so the teacher can get to know the child. The bulk of the students could be tested before school begins."

"Spending the first five days with a substitute isn't too good for kindergartners," she added.

Norman Kee, administrative assistant

for personnel, said kindergarten teachers would have to receive a full rate of pay for each day they tested children before the start of the school's calendar year. That pay would exceed the cost of hiring substitutes, he said.

Upon the suggestion of board Vice President E.J. McClendon, Mrs. Borowski moved to approve continuation of the assessment program and leave the assessment timetable to the discretion of administrators. That motion was unanimously approved.

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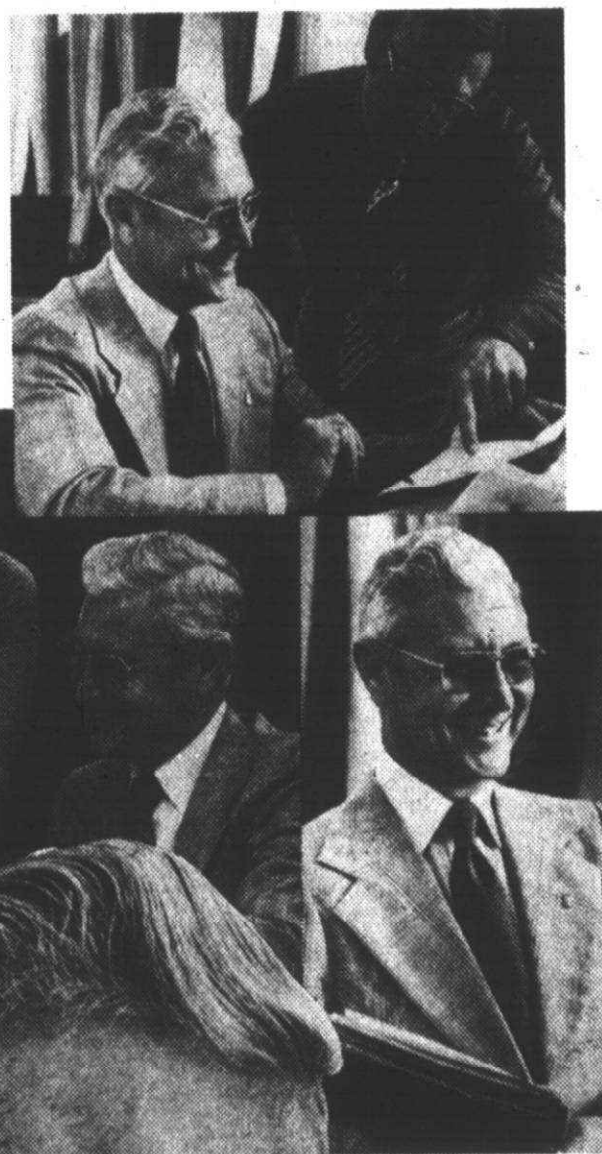
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Cinder in the grass

Crossing guard issue remains unresolved

Plymouth Township and Plymouth School District officials stubbornly clung to their positions on the school crossing guard issue at a joint meeting Monday night, when they met head-on with friendly arguments over who is responsible for the guard funding.

The two governing bodies adjourned the pre-meeting of the school board without a solution to the problem and left the existence of school crossing guards in Plymouth Township clouded with uncertainty.

The only possible steps taken toward a solution to the funding argument came in the form of two recommendations—one issued by township officials, and the other by school administrators.

TOWNSHIP CLERK Helen Richardson suggested a millage request for crossing guards on the ballot next June, while school Supt. John M. Hoben suggested the school district's attorney take the issue to court and "settle the questions once and for all."

But the meeting, requested by Plymouth Township officials to discuss the long-contested funding matter, produced no compromise that would budge either governing body from its position on the funding issue.

Unless the township or the school board amend their stands, school crossing guards will not help Plymouth Township children cross busy intersections on their way to and from school next fall.

Plymouth Township officials have refused to share the costs of crossing guards with the school district, despite the school board's threats to cut off crossing guard services this September in any municipality which refuses to share 50 per cent of the cost.

According to the school board's resolution, Plymouth Township must pay the \$7,000 bill for crossing guard services rendered during the 1975-76 school year as well as a \$12,700 bill for services rendered during the previous two years or face cut-off of crossing guard services altogether.

SCHOOL OFFICIALS note-Canton's willingness to pay its share of the crossing guard cost as well as the City of Plymouth's stand on the matter. The city has placed its money in escrow until Plymouth Township agrees to pay, or the school board cuts off crossing guards services in Plymouth Township.

School board members point to a survey of Wayne County school districts in which the majority of crossing guards are funded in part or in total by the municipality. They note an attorney general's opinion, negating the obligation of either school districts or municipalities to provide crossing guard services.

But Plymouth Township officials offer a different argument to support their refusal to pay.

The township, they say, has no voice in the hiring or firing of crossing guards or the construction of schools on busy streets.

If the township pays for crossing guards now, they fear, the school board may ask them to finance other services should another school financial crisis arise.

Mrs. Richardson offered a temporary compromise to the funding arguments at Monday's meeting. The township, she said, would probably loan \$7,000 to the school board for crossing guard services next year, if school officials agree to place a millage request for crossing guards on their ballot next June.

"LET ALL the municipalities work for the passage of the request," she said. "My firm belief is the responsibility lies with the school district."

School board members informally agreed to study the legal ramifications of Mrs. Richardson's suggestion, but Hoben expressed fear that voters would not renew the millage, even if it passed next June.

"Then we'd be stuck holding the bag and the whole amount," he objected.

School Trustee Tom Yack said a township loan of \$7,000 for crossing guards would not offer a solution to the problem this September.

"I'm not speaking for or against your proposition," Yack told township officials, "but, as I understand the school board's position, it would take more than \$7,000 to keep crossing guards in Plymouth Town-

ship. It would take paying the bill for the last three years."

School board Vice President E.J. McClendon said crossing guards perform a police function, a service normally provided by municipalities. Hoben cited the opinion of the school attorney on the matter.

"IT IS OUR counsel's opinion that the attorney general's opinion is wrong," the superintendent said. "He's of the persuasion that crossing guards are a matter of police protection."

"He suggests the possibility of a friendly lawsuit to get these questions resolved once and for all on a statewide basis. He's quite certain there's an argument here."

Plymouth Township, Mrs. Richardson noted, relies on the services of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department and the Michigan State Police for law enforcement and does not support its own police department.

"You state it's a police function," she said. "We do not have a police depart-

ment, and our roads are under the jurisdiction of Wayne County. That eliminates our responsibility."

Plymouth Township resident Carol Levitte, one of approximately 15 residents who attended last week's meeting, said the school board's stand on crossing guards represents "equal pay for unequal services."

"I'm against the township paying," Mrs. Levitte stated. "The school board pays for the safety of children who are bused, yet they don't want to pay for the safety of children who walk. Superior Township won't be paying anything for crossing guards, since all their children are bused."

"I DON'T UNDERSTAND dividing the children into two groups," Mrs. Levitte continued. "They're all children. We all pay the same taxes, yet some of the children don't get the same benefits."

Township resident Kathy Johnson said, "It's the taxpayer's money no matter who pays. I just hope someone pays, so we

have crossing guards in Plymouth Township next fall."

School board Trustee Marcia Borowski said a thin line divides the responsibilities of school districts and municipalities.

"Our main function is to provide kids with an education," she said. "A municipality's main function is to provide for the health, safety and welfare, but it's very difficult to draw a line and say this where the school's responsibilities end and the township's start."

"We could go on making logical extensions of what's needed to provide an education," she continued. "Maybe we should have our own fire department to protect the schools and put in sidewalks so kids can walk."

"But can't we share it?" Mrs. Borowski asked. "Can't we say this is something that isn't clear-cut and something we both desire? Can't we look at it that way? Let's work it out together. Let's share it."

W-W voters face bond issue

Residents in the Wayne-Westland School District will go to polls Sept. 27 to vote on two bond issues for renovation of existing buildings and construction of a vocational education center which would add 0.4 mill for debt retirement to tax bills.

The board of education last week formally adopted the ballot language for the two proposals. Supt. Timothy Dyer described this action as "perfunctory."

At its meeting last Monday the board unanimously approved preliminary action for the bond issue, enabling the administration to seek necessary approval from the state department of education. That approval was received Tuesday afternoon.

Under Proposition I, which includes building 10 classrooms at John Glenn and adding gym space at both Glenn and Wayne Memorial high schools, the district would borrow \$15.45 million from the state. This would require a millage increase of 0.3 to repay the loan.

For the average taxpayer this would mean an increase of 30 cents per \$1,000 of assessed property valuation or \$3.90 per year.

Under Proposition II, which includes a vocational-technical building and a building addition for special education, the state would loan the district \$4.15 million, meaning an increase of 0.1 mill.

Propositions I and II would total a 0.4 mill increase or a \$1 increase to \$5.20 per year.

Millage in the district for debt retirement, if the bond issue is approved, would total 7.4 mills.

"We agree to continue the same level (7.4 mills) for debt retirement for 30 years," said Supt. Timothy Dyer. "That's our part of the bargain. We know that level will meet our debt obligations."

Dyer added as previous debt obligations are paid off, the 7.4-mill levy could be reduced, but not below the 7 mill level which is the minimum millage the district must levy to qualify for a state loan.

The last bond issue approved for debt retirement was in 1966. The board tried twice last year, in June and December, for approval of similar bond issues. In June the issue failed by 400 votes, and in December by 89 votes.

Since then, the district has eliminated swimming pools, a field house, new administration building and new elementary schools from the proposals.

AS A RESULT of a survey conducted within the last three weeks by Ned Hubbell Associates, the district will split the former single proposition into two proposals.

"The survey indicated the people wanted separate issues—repair and renovation, and vocational education," said Dyer.

"Those most involved in the schools said they saw a need, but another 30 per cent said they were unaware."

"Our job is to communicate the urgency of this package to our community," said Dyer.

He encouraged residents to visit schools. "Repairs to existing buildings are paramount and a constant drain on our operating expenses," he explained. "We have survived another year of crisis maintenance."

"The roofs, electrical, ventilating, plumbing and heating problems...require major repairs and renovation. The operating budget simply cannot handle these kinds of expenditures," he added.

DYER EMPHASIZED the district must borrow funds to prevent further deterioration in the 40 district buildings and to protect students in the district.

Dyer referred to expanded physical education and athletic programs, including

women's sports, in discussing safety factors. "It is totally impossible to schedule all of our teams into existing gym space, and, therefore, hallways and storage areas are being used by athletes."

"This poses fire regulation problems as well as unsafe physical conditions," he said.

According to Dyer, "Only 30 per cent of our students go on to higher education. We've got to offer the best possible vocational education program and we're not doing that. We can't with the facilities we have."

DYER SAID recent legislation would qualify the district for matching funds to build a facility to teach welding, appliance repair, dental technology and other service-oriented skills.

Proposal II, which primarily considers vocational needs of secondary students, would also provide funds to modify existing buildings to accommodate wheel chair students, allowing attendance at regular classes.

Treasurer responds

Treasurer Carl Parsell took time out Tuesday evening during his report to the board to refute campaign charges of alleged fiscal mismanagement.

The treasurer, who lost to Anna Bradley in the Aug. 3 primary by 59 votes, answered charges made in a letter distributed by Very Concerned Citizens of Canton Township.

The letter alleged that the "no cost reserve police force" had already cost the township \$50,000, that the taping system for board meetings cost \$12,000, and that a state audit was in order because the previous administration had left the present

administration with a \$430,000 carry over supposedly earmarked for a second fire station.

Parsell said the taping system cost \$100, the reserve less than \$11,000 and that the carryover had been increased as of Aug. 1 to slightly more than \$1 million.

"The literature was incorrect," the treasurer said. "It wasn't quite a \$430,000 carryover, it was \$593,000."

"The carryover for the next year even after improvements of township buildings and investments in land was \$590,000."

"As of now, that carryover has increased to more than a million dollars."

Well, The Stroller would like to add a third. Insofar as his life is concerned, there is nothing more certain than with the arrival each year he will be singled out by young fellows with an eye to a journalistic career and asked for advice.

Each year it is the same, and these eager young fellows all ask the same questions— "What subjects should I take up in college?" and "Where is the best place to start a newspaper career?"

Each year as they come The Stroller can't help but smile when he tells them that he never went to college—never finished high school—and got his start by accident in one of the smallest papers in the land, a four-page small-town weekly in the foothills of the mountains.

They all appear stunned until he reveals his start and the luck that was his by being in the right place at the right time—even though he was considered a "pest" before he got started.

It all happened so suddenly and The Stroller still oftentimes thinks he is dreaming.

NEVER WILL he forget the morning he was invited by the old editor to join him on a new newspaper that was being established over in the city, four miles away.

Then he informed the old gent that he had never even finished his first year in high school and that he never felt comfortable in English classes, and so he didn't think he was qualified.

"Never mind that," he said, "I'll teach you. You have the basic knowledge of all sports (The Stroller's father had managed

our small town baseball team and kept all the averages posted in our little lunch room) and that is what I am looking for. I want a fellow to write sports and I'll teach you."

It was a wonderful opportunity, but The Stroller couldn't figure out how he could be taught newspaper writing without the benefit of either a high school or college education.

He learned quickly from one of the greatest teachers with whom he had ever come in contact.

"Never mind your lack of education, or book learning," he said, when the old editor called him in for his first lesson. "There are three important things you will need," he pointed out, "and all three can be developed."

The old gent, who had been around a long time and was considered one of the greatest editors in the east, then listed the three things most needed.

"FIRST," he said, "you must develop a photographic mind. When you looked at something, if even for only a moment, be sure you see it all—even the most minute detail."

"If you went to the theater and the stage was bare," he said, "you wouldn't enjoy the show. You have to have scenery. So, when you write a story you must set the scene for the readers. Tell them the positions you and your subjects were in when you obtained your information."

That's why you always will read opening paragraphs where "the old gent pulled himself up to his desk and said, etc., etc."

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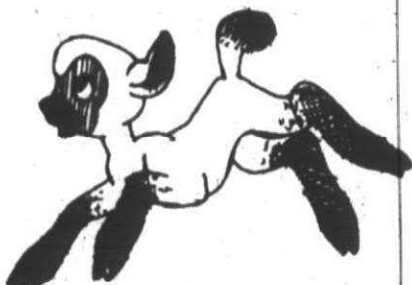

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Minor parties need more votes

The choice of party candidates in November's general election will be limited to Democratic and Republican nominees unless a suit filed by the American Civil Liberties Union succeeds.

The suit, filed in federal district court on behalf of seven minor political parties, challenges Public Act 94, a new Michigan law requiring a certain percentage of the primary vote before a party is eligible to be placed on the general election ballot.

According to unofficial totals for five minor parties participating in the recent primary, no party amassed the necessary votes (3,600) to qualify for November's election.

The totals for each party, with two counties left to report to the state, and complete totals for Wayne and Oakland counties are:

ACCORDING TO Howard Simon, executive director of the Michigan ACLU, these five parties and two others, the Communist and Human Rights parties, are represented in the suit that was argued before a panel of three federal district court judges two months ago. No decision has been handed down at this time.

"If the law (Public Act 94) is declared unconstitutional, I would presume the parties will have the right to be placed on the November ballot even though they didn't get the required amount of votes (three-tenths of one per cent overall)," Simon says.

The ACLU director adds, "I think we should win the suit. Similar statutes in other states were declared unconstitutional by the supreme court."

"THE PURPOSE of this law is supposed to insure that the ballot doesn't become overcrowded by parties that have no

public support. This new law goes beyond that. It doesn't show how much public support a party has—the petition of qualified voter's signatures that is required before a party can be placed on the primary ballot does that."

Simon objects to the way voters were required to decide whether to vote either

straight minor party or major party tickets. He says the fact that voters couldn't split their party affiliations probably hurt the minor parties.

Simon continues, "This kind of requirement doesn't show how much support a party has. The law contrives to exclude minor parties."

Center offers alcoholic treatment

When police in the metropolitan area came across drunks, they used to have the option of hauling them in to jail or leaving them to sober up in the streets. But a new alcoholic treatment facility, the Harbor Light Center at 415 Brainard in Detroit, will serve anyone from anywhere who needs emergency alcoholic care.

The center opened July 30, after months of planning by a group of city, county and state officials.

The new unit is a \$135,000 tri-governmental program created as a six-month pilot program to precede Public Act 339, a state law that decriminalizes public drunkenness beginning January 1977.

The Harbor Light facility, which is managed by the Salvation Army, has facilities available to accommodate up to 17 men and five women for a five- to seven-day stabilization period. After that, clients are either referred to another agency or become patients in Harbor Light's regular six- to 24-week rehabilitation program for alcohol abuse and other various drug ailments.

WAYNE COUNTY Commissioner George Kileen, a longtime proponent of alcoholic treatment programs, said the emergency care unit is not just an alcohol detoxification center. "Anybody who is

judged to be intoxicated, whether it turns out to be alcohol or not, will be accepted at the center on an emergency basis," he said.

Kileen continued, "The lack of sustaining emergency care for these problems has been a real tragedy in our community because the people involved have been left without recourse except jail or meandering through dangerous streets."

"Many hospitals and clinics won't accept people they consider drunk because they think the individual can't pay or they think drunkenness is not a serious enough health problem."

THE COMMISSIONER added that the new law which decriminalizes public drunkenness only gives legal sanction to what he said has been "a common, defacto practice on the part of the police for some time."

Partly to help prevent jail overcrowding and partly in sympathy against criminal charges for excessive drinking only, police officers no longer arrest as many people as they did in the past for alcohol abuse, Kileen said.

He added, "Our concern is what is happening to those people, and the whole philosophy behind the emergency center is to provide a means of care for these individ-

uals who are surely in as much need as ever."

MARSHALL GANT, assistant director of Harbor Lights, said he thinks the unit is fulfilling a big need in the area. "I am really elated at this pilot project being started. It was sorely needed," he said.

Gant continued, "Alcoholics can die so quickly it would make your head swim. A drunk tank is not the place for them. If we get someone that we feel is in dangerous condition, we get them down to Detroit General."

Gant added that patients have been treated from all over the state and that referrals have been utilizing every treatment program available.

ANOTHER ADVANTAGE to a treatment center such as Harbor Lights is the easing of the taxpayer's burden for alcoholics. According to Dr. Edward Leibson, Wayne County coordinator for substance abuse treatment, having the alcoholic treatment transferred from the criminal justice system to the public health department and recognized as an illness will cut the cost to taxpayers from \$300 per person per day to \$21.

"Harbor Lights is another great addition to one of the finest drug treatment centers in the nation," Kileen, concluded.

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At national tourney

Plymouth finishes 2d

Capping an excellent baseball season, the Plymouth Merchants, after winning a playoff game for the Northwest Mickey Mantle League championship, last week finished second in a 19-team field at the National Amateur Baseball Federation championships.

Snyder's advances in playoffs

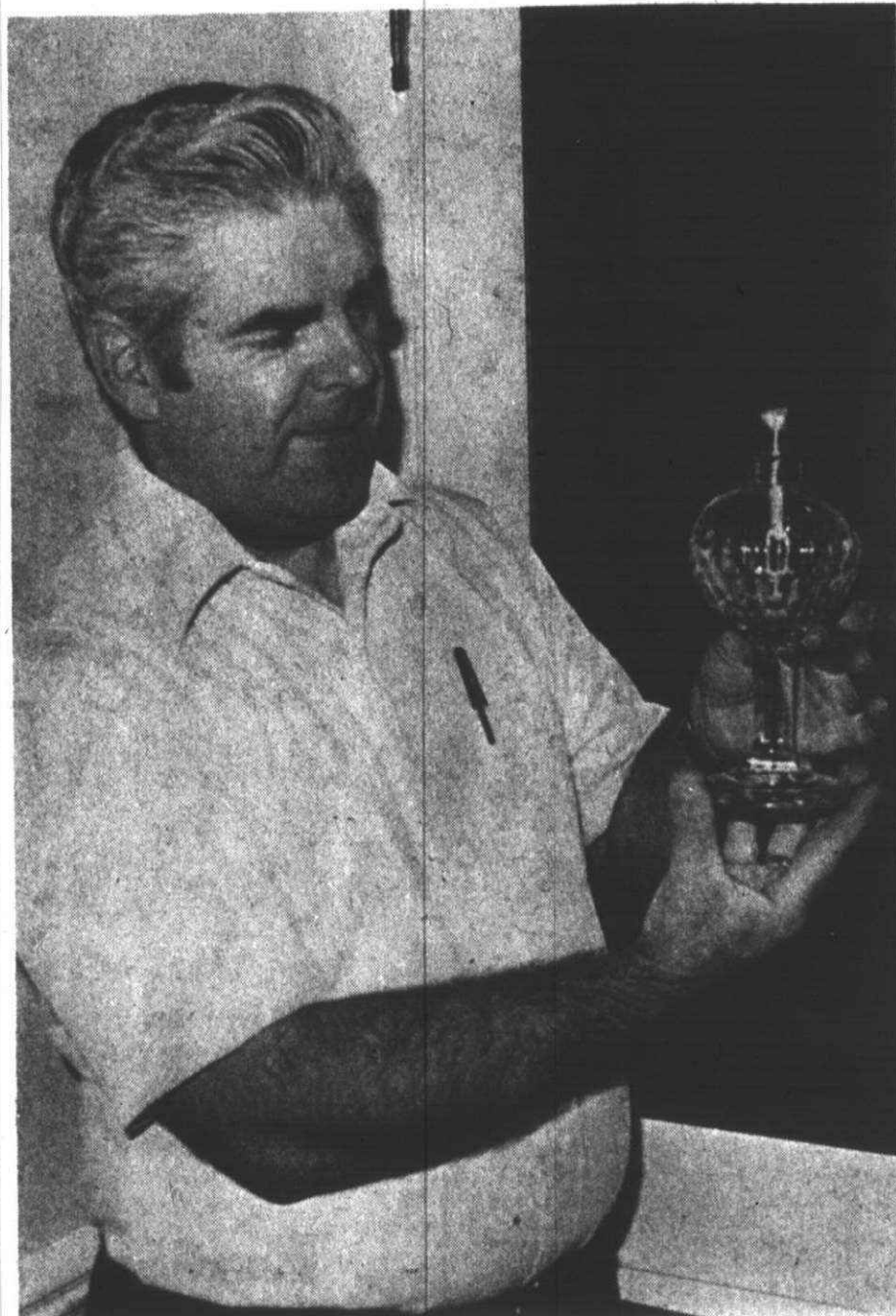

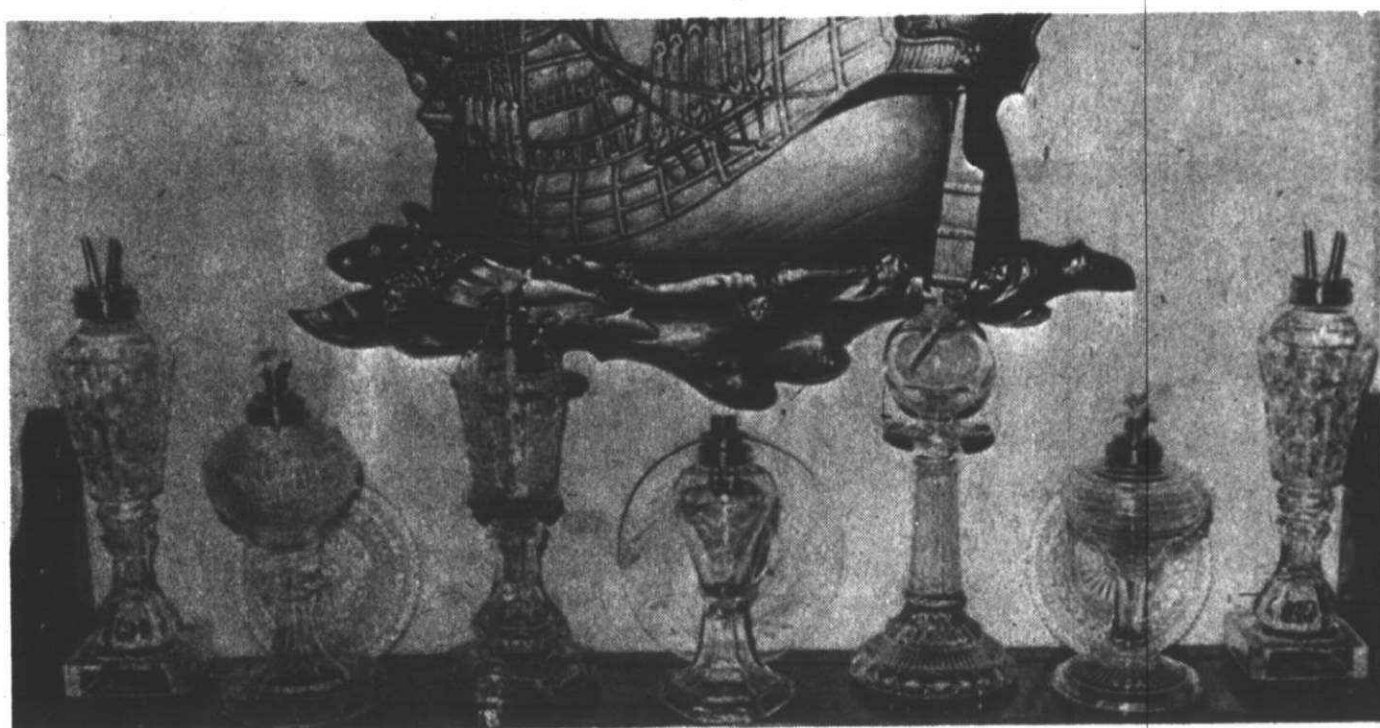

Antique shows not for women only

Antiquer: A female who frequents antique shops, shows and auction sales in hopes of adding to her collection of old "treasures?"

Not at all.

When the Plymouth Symphony League Antique Mart opens its annual three-day run during the Fall Festival, a goodly percentage of the clientele will be male. These are not reluctant husbands, coerced into the Plymouth Cultural Center by strong-willed wives.

Ask any dealer.

Some of the most avid and discerning collectors are men. They are interested in World War items, flasks, pipes, tools, coins, license plates, or clocks.

For Bob West of Penniman Avenue, it is lamps.

WEST'S COLLECTION of whale oil lamps has led him to the study of history, glass-making, and the art of polishing glass. He has developed a fine sense of appreciation for the skills and art of the early glassblowers and glassmakers.

"I have 50 books here," he said, pointing to his lamp and glass library. "Every one was written by a man, and not one of them would let his wife dust or polish his glass."

"You know glass-making was the first industry in America. The finest glass in the world was made here."

He went on to explain that the greats came from Europe—Steuben from Germany, Tiffany from France, Larsen from Sweden—but it was in this country that they created their greatest pieces.

"When Emil Larsen laid a cobalt ring on crystal," he said, with reverence in his tone, "the whole plant stopped to watch."

WHALE OIL lamps have small deep fonts and were luxury items, in their day.

"Only the wealthy could afford whale oil. It cost 50 cents for a half gallon. That was as much as an average man earned in a week."

"They were used just for entertaining, and were emptied and cleaned after each use."

West said servants were not allowed to handle the precious lamps. The mistress of the house took care of them.

He showed a little sparking lamp. When the daughter's beau came courting, the amount of oil in the font was measured to mark the exact time of his departure.

"And he didn't stay one second longer," said West.

The deep fonts on the whale oil lamps were designed to keep the highly explosive oil as far away as possible from the flame.

"Whale oil blew up more houses than it lit," he said.

BOB WEST has cleaned, polished and refurnished many of his lamps. Some are Sandwich glass and most are flint glass. "Flint and lead-based glass preceded lead crystal," he explained.

The two-pronged burner was invented by Benjamin Franklin to double the amount of light from a single lamp.

"Then kerosene came along in 1855 and everything changed," said West. "Did you know the United States supplied the majority of kerosene lamps to the whole world?"

The fonts were larger, wicks were wide and flat, and for the first time, families of average means had smokeless light in their homes after sundown.

As West's collection grew and he brought back the glow of life to the neglected and misused glass, he achieved a sort of rapport and respect for the maker. He also has become an expert, a historian of the glass industry in this country.

OLD TOOLS hold a fascination for Robert Delaney, a Plymouth attorney.

The soft glow of silver and brass, and the patina of the maple or rosewood give them an aesthetic beauty, but each is a useful, working tool. Delaney has experimented with oils and stains to restore the wood. The metals have been buffed and polished and missing parts replaced.

He has several from the Duncan Phyfe era and he explained, "The craftsmen and the woodworkers made their own tools."

A scraper was carved from rosewood and dated 1854. The blade was set in silver and three pieces of mother-of-pearl were set in the wood as an added touch of craftsmanship and pride. Master furniture designer Duncan Phyfe could have used such a tool as he created his distinctive pieces.

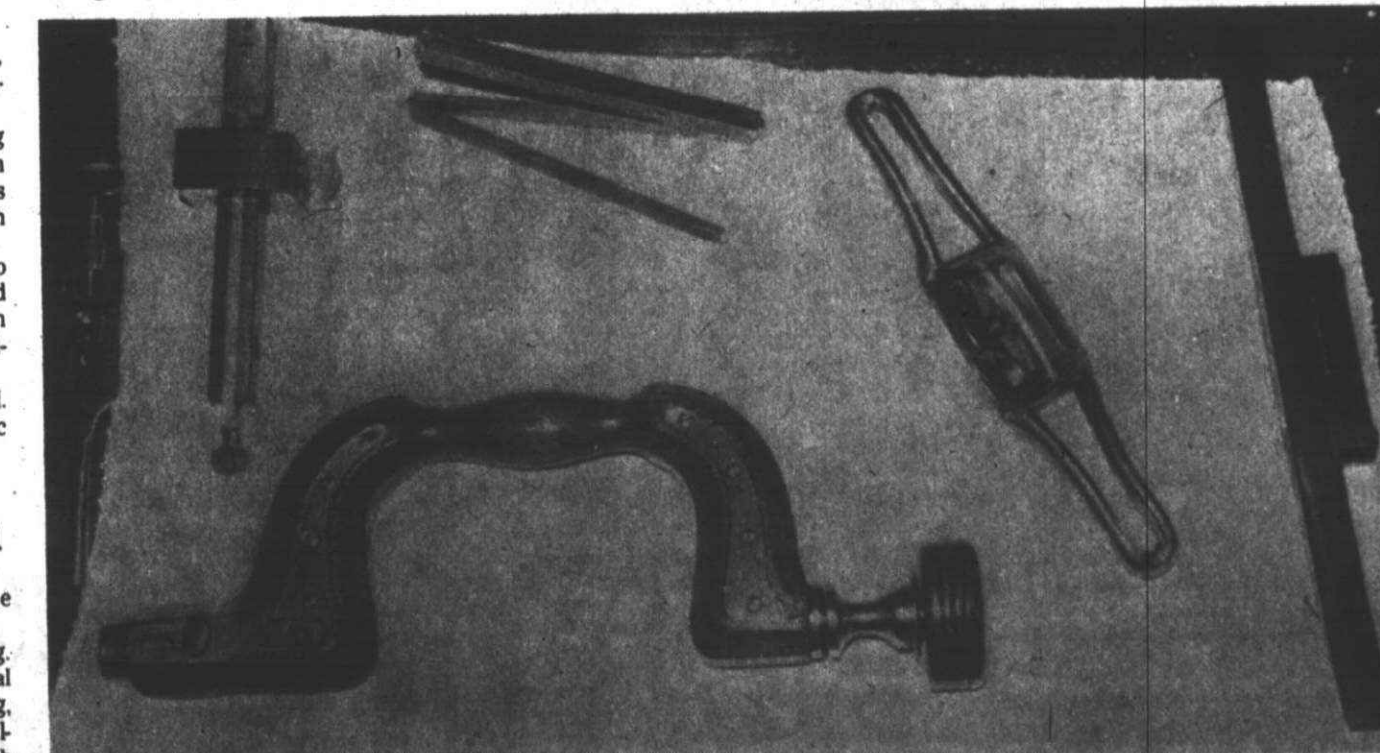
A wooden brace, made of maple and decorated with brass, will drill and bore as well as the latest model. But any home decorator would be proud to display it in his home as a work of art.

Besides enjoying the heft of the tool and the beauty of its workmanship, Delaney derives pleasure from the fact that each is useable. The brass scribe and the gleaming maple wood planestill can perform the job they were created for a hundred years ago.

He too has assembled books concerning his collection and can immediately recognize the age and use of antique tools.

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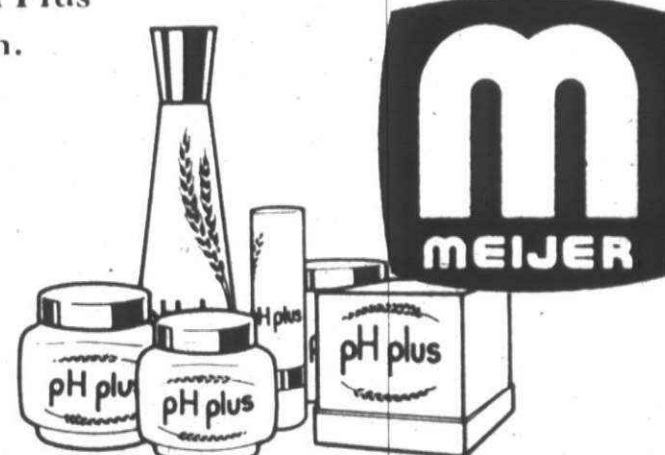

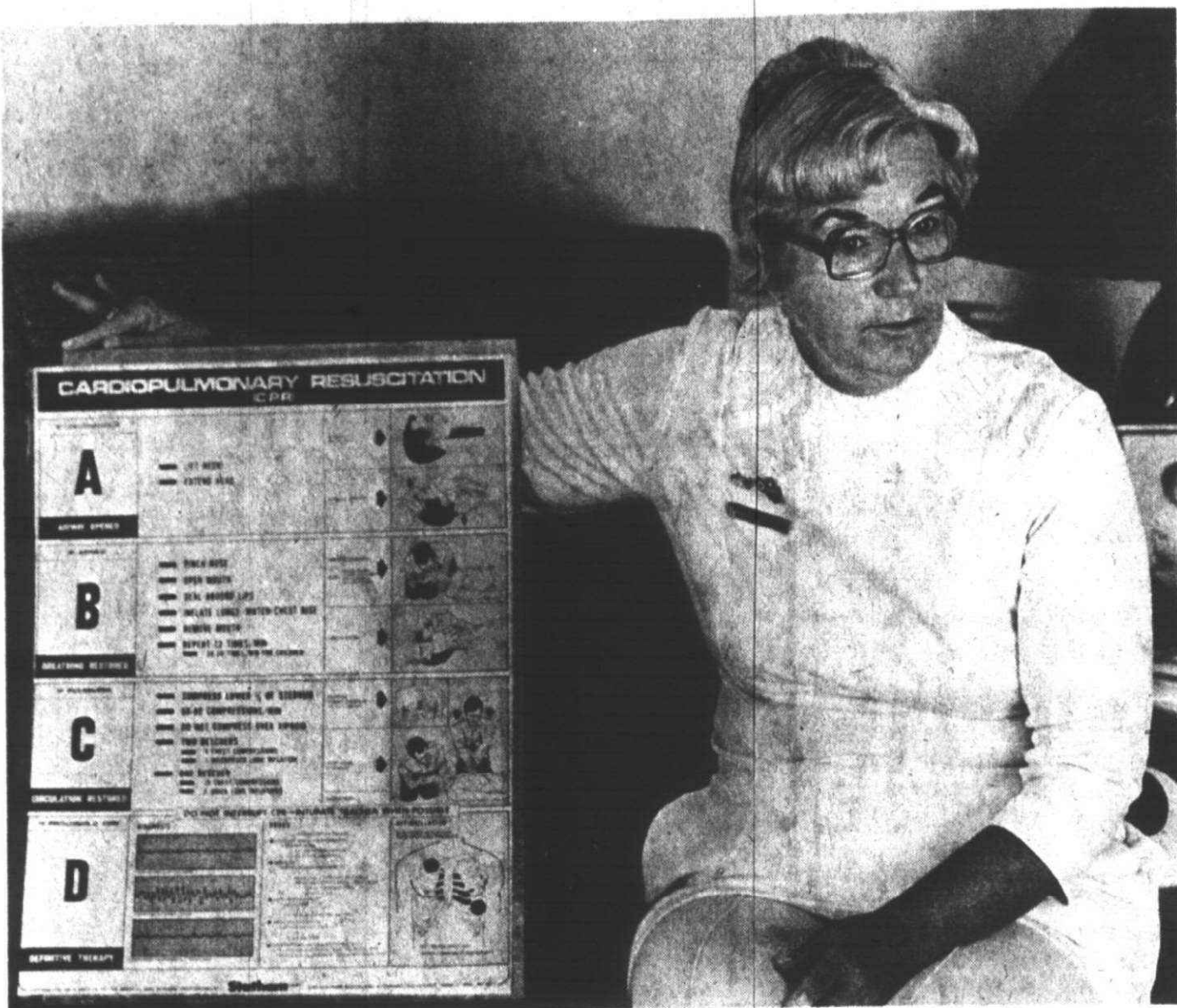

Help accident victims says nurse

By JANAN GHANNAM

Frequently mistaken for a heart attack, the "cafe coronary"—choking on food—ranks sixth among the most common accidents in the United States.

Recognizing the tricky symptoms and how to treat the victim are some of life-saving techniques Mary Ellen Janssen of Farmington teaches in her Red Cross First Aid and Personal Safety course.

Mrs. Janssen, a surgical nurse at Henry Ford Hospital Fairlane Center, has been a Red Cross volunteer for 10 years, teaching people in the importance of accident prevention and life-saving procedures.

Currently, Mrs. Janssen is teaching a certified Red Cross class Tuesday nights at Henry Ford Hospital Fairlane Center in Dearborn.

THE COURSE will instruct participants in giving immediate care to the injured while medical assistance is being sought.

"This means students will be equipped to handle temporary care of such injuries as poisoning, respiratory failure, heart attack, wounds, burns, fractures and frost-bites," said Mrs. Janssen.

She explained that often lay persons are afraid to give medical help after an accident, thinking their assistance may result in a law suit against them.

"I encourage my students to help accident victims," said Mrs. Janssen, "but to step aside as soon as professional help arrives."

Mrs. Janssen's students include, skiers, swimmers, airline pilots, ski patrol instructors, dietitians, housewives, businessmen and most abundantly, campers.

"With the current trend in camping, we are glad to see so many campers take advantage of this course," she said. "Unfortunately though, there are still many campers who just take off into the woods without being prepared for accidents."

DEVOTING A SEGMENT of her course to "cafe coronary," Mrs. Janssen urges her students to recognize the difference between choking on food and a heart attack.

"Often a person in a restaurant will be choking on food and will be treated for a heart attack," she said.

She explained the best way to determine

the difference is by asking the victim, "Can you speak?" If the victim has swallowed food and cannot speak, it is safe to assume he is choking.

"We demonstrate the various ways to relieve the victim in this type of situation, making sure proper techniques are understood and implemented."

MRS. JANSSEN also stresses cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and mouth-to-mouth resuscitation as life-saving techniques.

"CPR is not required in a class of this format," she said, "but I believe it is important in any emergency situation."

How to stop bleeding, treatment of burns, head, arm and leg wraps and methods to treat poisoning are all emphasized.

As part of the poisoning prevention segment, Mrs. Janssen includes alcoholism and its treatment.

"Many of the big companies are stressing treatment of alcoholism for their employees. It is the highest cause of absenteeism," she said. "I particularly focus on the treatment of alcoholism and its effects on youth."

A nurse for 32 years and mother of five children, Mrs. Janssen feels teaching first aid and personal safety is one of the most valuable contributions she can make.

"We've had such an overwhelming response to this course we will probably offer another session in September," she said.

ONCE THE COURSE is satisfactorily completed, students will receive a certificate which for many will open up new career and leisure opportunities. For some, it will mean the ability to try out for the National Ski Patrol or a position on a retailer's security force.

Whatever the reason for taking course the result will be the same—people trained to help.

"As long as the people want this service, I will continue teaching it," she said. "What better way to serve the community than to educate them. If my teaching accounts for one life saved—then it is well worth it."

Learn to help heart victims

If you should be on the scene when a person has a heart attack or suffers severe choking, don't just stand there. Do something.

This is the thinking is the thinking behind an instruction session in cardiopulmonary resuscitation to take place from 7-9:30 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 19 at the Henry Ford Hospital Fairlane Center, 19401 Hubbard, Dearborn.

Certified instructors will prepare members of the public to deal with such attacks by demonstrating CPR techniques and giving participants the opportunity to revive Resusci-Annie, a life-size manikin with an inflatable chest and a recorder print-out measuring compression and inflation.

CPR techniques combine external heart massage and mouth-to-mouth resuscitation, which have been effectively used on both adults and infants in the event the heart stops, whether due to heart attack, stroke, drowning, electrical shock, choking or other causes.

More than 15 per cent of Michigan deaths in 1975 were caused by heart attack. Some of these lives might have been saved had a bystander been skilled in the use of cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

Last year more than 50,000 Michigan residents trained in CPR. This year training is being given to almost double this number.

Participants in the Fairlane Center class should wear loose clothing and be at least 16 years of age.
