Rampant absentee ballot abuse bared

Michigan cities and townships are paying a tremendous price for laws that have liberalized the granting of absentee ballots.

A survey of Observer Newspapers communities in western Wayne County showed that seven to more than 14 per cent of voters were taking advantage of absentee voting privileges. sometimes improperly. In some Oakland County communities, "the word" got around and nearly 20 per cent of voters used absentee ballots.

Basically, three kinds of persons

may use absentee voters (AV) ballots: Those who are ill or disabled; those who are age 60 or older; and those who "expect" to be out of town.

The evidence is clear that many persons are taking advantage of AV ballots in November presidential elections to beat standing in long lines at the polls.

THE HIGH COST of AV ballots is apparent in several ways:

•It simply costs clerks more to process AV ballots. Estimates range from \$1 to \$11 per ballot, with an average of about \$4, compared to 15 to 45 cents for a machine vote.

· AV ballots are cast on paper, and so there is more room for human error. Elections in the 2d Congressional District and Canton Township were badly snarled because of great numbers of AV ballots.

· Michigan is losing the advantages of machine ballot technology when vast proportions of voters use AV paper ballots.

Nov. 2 presidential election, 692 of the 4,890 persons who voted used AV-a hefty 14.1 per cent.

Next highest was Canton Township, where 1,334 of the 10,637 who voted used AV. That amounts to 12.5 per cent in a community with a relatively young population.

There was a reason in Canton. The slate of Supervisor Robert Greenstein, defeated in the August Democratic primary, staged a write-in campaign, and the easiest way to do that is by using AV ballots.

Greenstein lost in a close vote, but he was unable to get a recount of AV votes. It seems that 15 poll workers in the AV "precincts" voted directly on the machines, and so the number of votes there was 15 greater than the

number of paper AV ballots.

Livonia recorded 9.8 per cent AV ballots, Garden City seven per cent and Plymouth Township 10 per cent.

Republican Carl Pursell's cliff-hanger 344-vote victory in the 2d Congressional District was challenged by Democrat Edward Pierce entirely on the basis of AV paper ballots. The salaries of clerks, canvassing boards, lawyers and judges haven't been tal-

IT'S PERFECTLY CLEAR that the main motivation for use of AV ballots is to beat long lines at the polls. Canton had two-hour lineups in the

presidential election. In the August primary, only 4.6 per cent used AV ballots, but in November 12.5 per cent used AV.


In Garden City, AV usage was three per cent in the May presidential primary and seven per cent in November, when lines were 90 minutes long.


Livonia's usage jumped from 3.2 per cent in the presidential primary to 7.1 per cent in August and 9.8 in No-

City of Plymouth AVs leaped from four per cent in May to 10 per cent in August and 14 per cent in November.

Canton cop group wants all certified

Members of the Canton Police Department have formed a non-political organization which, they hope, will increase the professionalism of their department and curb criticisms of of the controversial force.

According to Robert van Lith, president of the new association, the Canton Police Officers Association (CPOA) is a "social, fraternal, nonpolitical organization" formed to foster unity in the department.

Despite similarity between the organization's name and that of the Police Officers Association of Michigan (a statewide police union) van Lith says the Canton organization is not a union with wage bargaining power.

On the contrary, the organization was formed to increase the police department's professionalism and remove the shadow of politics from the

The department was a major issue in the township's election campaign. Supervisor Harold Stein criticized the manner in which the department was tablished, while former Supervisor Robert Greenstein, who then served as the department's chief, vigorously

supported it. Some of the officers were getting

despondent because of the political atmosphere," explained van Lith, who spearheaded founding of the police officers association. "We were losing uniformity in our ranks.

"Through this organization, we'd like to retain our professionalism and integrity and remove ourselves from politics. I know they sound like highfalutin words, but I don't know how else to say it."

Stein said he believes the organization will improve the lines of communication between the township's administration and the police depart-

"I think the intent is good," the supervisor said.

Although the association is still in the infancy stage, van Lith said 20 of the police department's 24 members have already joined. He expected members to ratify the organization's charter this Sunday.

Although the association was officially founded on Dec. 20, the outanization still lacks a president. Other officers include van Lith as vice president; G.L. Stevens, secretary; Roger Pearsall, treasurer; and Dan Antieau, sergeant at arms.

Parsell stumps for POAM

Drop Teamsters, cops urged

An intensive drive to sign up police officers in two competing labor unions has started in the state since the Police Officers Association of Michigan (POAM) and the Teamsters' law enforcement division severed connections.

Police officers in Plymouth confirmed the fact that Carl Parsell, POAM executive director and former Canton Township treasurer, has been trying to persuade them to drop their Teamster affiliation and sign up with

Plymouth's two-year police contract expires with the city July 1, 1977. On Jan. 1, 1977 the POAM officialy changed from a fraternal service organization into what Parsell calls "a

Three years ago Parsell was instrumental in getting the Plymouth police officers to accept the Teamsters as their bargaining agent. Parsell said recently that he supported the Teamsters in the past because "there was no other choice.'

"When those police departments signed up with the Teamsters they took the only option available at the time," Parsell said recently. "Now they can choose between us, the Teamsters, or doing the negotiations themselves.

On Nov. 29 the POAM executive board voted to expel Teamster-affiliated departments from the POAM. Parsell explained that this was done because the Teamsters was openly soliciting membership from independent members of the POAM and because Teamsters Local 214 failed to pay three months dues.

Prompting the POAM expulsion was a letter mailed out by the Teamsters earlier that month asking its members to vote on whether the Teamsters local should disaffiliate with the POAM. Before the results of that vote came out, the POAM expelled the Teamsters. Teamster members later voted 647 to 136 to disaffiliate with the

Teamster members cited a "lack of legislative action" on the part of the POAM, in discussing why the two groups split. Parsell himself became an issue by his support of the Canton reserves. Teamsters charge that Parsell's support of the substandard pay reserves and certified Canton cops is an example of bad union practice.

IN THE COMPETITION to represent police departments, Parsell claims the POAM has an edge due to the fact that his association charges \$7 a month union dues compared to the \$17 per month dues in the Team-

Joe Valenti, Teamsters Local 214 president, states that Parsell and the POAM cannot provide adequate union representation at thw prices it is

"The POAM now talks about the establishment of a full-service labor o rganization calling for \$7 a month," Valenti said. "Approximately two years ago, in a survey conducted by Mr. Parsell, he stated that in order for the POAM to duplicate the level of service now being provided by the Teamsters union, it would take \$25 a

"In 1975 Mr. Parsell revised his figures for full-service to \$18 a month, and revised what was meant by fullservice. Again, in April of 1976, he revised the cost to \$12 a month and again revised his definition of fullservice. Now Mr. Parsell claims that it will only take \$7 a month for full service but has not told police officers what "full service" means.

"One can assume two things, states Valenti, "number one that if we all wait a little longer it will only be \$3 a month. Or, number two, Mr. Parsell, along with other members of the POAM, really do not know what it costs to render full service on a fulltime basis.'

Parsell claims the POAM can do the job at the lower price since many of the people who will handle negotiations are already members of the POAM executive board.

"However, we will hire four fulltime people to work on labor negotiations," Parsell said.

Parsell boasts that the POAM union will be composed of "policemen represented by policemen." The Teamsters counters that their bargainers have more labor experience.

"I don't have a problem per se with the word Teamsters." Parsell said. "Some members do, but I don't. But I worry about the influence of the Teamsters organization on police officers. When we acted as ther chaperpone, I felt we could watch out for that. It's just that I have a fear of outside control of police departments.'

Bitter about coffee prices? Shopper boycott brewing

If the price of coffee continues to soar at its present rate, 1977 may be a bitter one for caffeine lovers.

According to Bureau of Labor Statistics, averages for the Detroit area, a one-pound can of coffee in November 1975 sold for \$1.54. The same pound of coffee in November 1976 cost \$2.26, an increase for the year of 72 cents or a

six cent price hike every month. Such dramatic increases in a product so thoroughly entrenched in every day life do not go unnnoticed, and harried consumers are beginning to ask when it will end.

But there is the reluctance of food industry officials to speak to the issue or to furnish information about where retail coffee prices are headed.

"I have no comment on how high prices will go," said the Detroit area sales manager for a large coffee company. This is a very political question. There are rumors of a boycott, and I can't say anything."

Local store managers, however, have to contend with customer dissatisfaction on a more immediate level and were less hesitant to com-

"Hopefully, prices won't go up any more," said Mike Selenba, manager of the Kroger store in Canton. "The cost is starting to hurt coffee purchases, and we dfinitely have had complaints.'

Terry Griffith, manager of Meijer Thrifty Acres, was also unable to predict what shoppers could expect to pay for coffee in the near future.

"That's a hard question to answer." he ssaid. "I don't know. "I know people are beginning to make comments about drinking other things than coffee."

ALTHOUGH THERE IS no organized coffee boycott in the Plymouth-Canton area, a random sample of shoppers indicates that there is a limit to what people will pay for the

Joseph Giacinto and his wife Carol of Plymouth Township both said they would consider supporting a boycott if one were started.

"As it is we have been steadily cutting down the amount of coffee we drink," remarked Mrs. Giacinto. "Today I only bought one pound of coffee instead of a three-pound can.

"If it came down to doing without it completely, I think I could manage. But I know I would miss my morning Giacinto added that he, too, would

miss drinking coffee, but felt it would be worth it if prices came down as a result of people boycotting coffee. Leslie Raymoor of Plymouth said she had already switched to drinking tea as a protest against the price of

coffee. "I don't miss it either," she remarked. "I feel better, and it's good to know I don't have to have that cup of coffee."

Mr. and Mrs. George Jackson of Plymouth both said they had made efforts to reduce the amount of coffee

they drank. "We have cut down considerably," said Mrs. Jackson, "and I would stop buying it completely if prices continue to go up.

The only dissenting view was offered by Mrs. Martin Jones of Plymouth. She said she enjoyed coffee too much to give it up no matter how much it cost.

"I like to drink coffee," she said, "and I'm at the age where I might as well do what I enjoy. It's true that coffee has become quite expensive, but if I want to drink it, I have to pay for it." She also said she would not support a formal boycott.

If the frustration at escalating prices continues to grow, 1977 may be the year that coffee looses its status as the national drink.

Stein sits on denied check

Robert Greenstein, former supervisor who is now a Canton certified police officer, attempted to return a \$47 check he received for patrolling to the township's general fund but Supervisor Harold Stein doesn't know what to do with it.

"He is an employee of the township and he will be paid," said Stein, who recently defeated Greenstein for the top spot in the tonwnship government. "He can donate that money to the humane society as far as I'm concerned."

Officials of the township say that Stein will consult with the township's legal counsel to determine if it is legal for an employee to return his paycheck to the general fund.

In returning the check, Greenstein referred to himself as "a volunteer policeman" and, as such, donates his time to help the department and the township.

Until Nov. 20, Greenstein held the title of police-chief as well as township supervisor. The police post was unpaid. Greenstein's annual salary as supervisor was \$19,000. He did police work at night.

At the first board meeting of the Stein administration Greenstein was demoted to the rank of certified police officer which calls for a wage of \$3.82

DEPUTY TREASURER Mike Gorman said he questioned the legality of Greenstein's gesture.

"No employee has ever done it before," Gorman said. "The only thing I can think of in that area is that Joyce Willis donated the \$10 per meeting she received on the ZBA (Zoning Board of Appeals) to the recreation department."

Ms. Willis was not a township employee, but an appointed official.

"Greenstein gave the check to Stein and as far as I know,/Stein's still got it," Gorman said.

Stein hotly denies the charge. "He was out of town when the schedule was drawn up," Stein said. "Therefore he was not scheduled. That's the whole story. I wish somebody would print the truth instead of all this b.s.

Plymouth Center eyed for jail

State officials are looking at the vacant property of the Plymouth Child Development Center as a possible prison facility for both men and women.

The 800 acres on both sides of Sheldon, north of Five Mile in Northville Township, has been an annual \$300,000 drain on the Wayne County budget since 1974 when most mentally retarded children were transferred to private homes.

Although the state is considering the possibility of using the buildings as prison facilities, officials at Schoolcraft College and Wayne State University are considering revising an earlier idea of using the site for a joint educational center.

sidered for the prison. Prison space for female felons will be needed next summer when the state's first women's correctional facility is completed in Pittsfield Township near Ypsilanti State Hospital.

The state now contracts with Detroit to house 347 women in the Detroit House of Corrections (DeHoCo), also located in Northville Township about three miles west of the Child Development Center.

The Ypsilanti prison will house 270 inmates leaving a surplus of at least 77 Yemale prisoners when the women's portion at DeHoCo is phased

Because of the size of the Child Development Center, Ms. Light said the state also is considering the site for male prisoners to alleviate crowded conditions in existing prisons.

An increase of 400 in the state's prison population is expected this year when Michigan's mandatory two-year sentencing bill for crimes committed with a gun becomes effective.

Ms. Light and other state and county officials toured the center last month. She said the state isn't at the point of making a transaction and is looking at alternate sites, such as camps and air bases. But she stated other alternatives aren't as amenable because the sites were either unavailable or the renovation costs were too

Because the center has dormitorystyle buildings instead of cell blocks, minimum and medium security prisoners would be housed at the center if it is selected for prison use.

WAYNE COUNTY officials have been trying to earn revenue from the land since financing fell through for Father Vaughn Quinn's alcohol rehabilitation center.

M.H. Ashley, director of the building division of the county board of auditors, says every effort is being made to lease the center property. Ashley says it is premature to discuss the prison plan but adds that no one has shown any real interest in the land except the corrections depart-

Grote defends SC leisure time classes

Schoolcraft College offers a comphrehensive program of adult leisure time classes, and most are at least partially state funded. The whole matter is becoming a matter of controversy in the state capitol.

The college's Community Services program was designed in five areas of concern: 1) in-service, 2) personal enrichement, 3) cultural and public affairs, 4) avocational and 5) public services.

According to Schoolcraft's 1976 catalog, "They may be shaped into a regular course, seminar, workshop, clinic, conference, concert or any combination."

Dean of Community Services Ron Griffith and President C. Nelson Grote feel a community college's mission is to provide courses to benefit the entire community, not just those who plan to use Schoolcraft as a stepping stone to a four year college.

SUCH CLASSES in community colleges have become controversial in the Michigan Legislature mainly because they have been funded by scarce state dollars.

State Rep. Richard A. Young (D-Dearborn Heights), head of the community colleges subcommittee of the house appropriations committee, has been vocal on the issue, although not particularly at School-

Schoolcraft currently offers more than 100 state-funded community services

Another 14 community services courses can be taken for no credit and are not state funded

These include: Microwave Oven Cooking Workshop, For Women: Starting a Business, Do Something Different, Hunter Safety for Youth, Preperation for NAISE

Certification Tests (National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence), Games Couples Can Play, Overcoming Depression, A Shyness Workshop, New Horizons, Basic Law Enforcement for Police Reserves, Senior Forum, Fencing Club, Handball and Paddleball, and Lamaze Childbirth Education.

THE COLLEGE'S criteria for offering credit and using state funds are at least 16 hours of lectures and-or 32 lab hours.

Among courses in community service which offer college credit and are state funded are: Eliminating Self-Defeating Behavior, Explorations in ESP, Advanced Volleyball, Beekeeping for Beginners, the Metric System, Citizen's Band Radio-Toy or Tool?, Beginning Macrame and Collective Barganing Workshop.

"Roughly 33 per cent fo our students are enrolled in our Community Services program," said Dr. Grote. "To make them pay extra for their classes, and not use state funds that we have been provided with, is discriminatory.'

DR. GROTE feels the public doesn't understand the issue because of an inaccurate story in the Detroit Free Press. "Colleges Under Fire for Kiddie Courses." The story told how community colleges in the state have used state funds to teach grade school and pre-grade school children leisure time courses. The story named Mott Community College, Flint, as an of-

'Mott has been a leader in non-academic courses, and in their schedules they helped promote the Flint grade schools' program of teaching these courses," said Dr. Grote. "These kiddie courses were never taught at Mott or any other community college that I know of," he said.







The passage of SB 1570 (campaign finance and disclosure; and HB 6350 (partial public funding) means that for the first time in Michigan's history, we are going to have gubernatorial campaigns financed primarily by small contributions from the public, not large contributions from a se-

paigns with public disclosures of contributions and equalization of monies for the state races for public office.

However, onot to put a damper on your celebration, we still have two sections of the 1975 political reform package that have not been opened into law for the Christmas season. They are the lobbying disclosure and conflict of interest parcels.

Stein balks at farm sale offer

Jack Marts, owner of Children's Farm and Riding School in Canton has offered to sell his establishment to the township for \$225,000.

The community's "quality of life" and recreation opportunities would be expanded, according to Marts, if Canton made such a purchase.

Supervisor Harold Stein said Thursday that he visited Marts's farm at 2350 Denton recently, but stressed that his administration isn't seriously considering Marts's offer.

"There's really nothing to it," Stein said. "He's been trying to peddle that farm for I don't know how long. And he's spoken to two previous boards about it. I listened to the man, and I'd be willing to see his presentation if he wants to go before the whole township board with it. But right now I've got more important things to worry about then what happens to that farm."

Undaunted, Marts believes that Canton "owes its residents" more in the area of recreation "than just baseball diamonds and a couple bike trails."

Marts claims that if Canton Tonwship took over the operation of his farm it would be making a progressive step "towards providing a diverse recreation program for the

THE FARM would be self-supporting, said Marts, if Canton would charge people from other communities for the use of the facilities.

"We propose to Canton," states Marts in a letter to the board, "that our present program be continued. The rationale is to have tuition-paid students pay for the operation (of the farm) which will allow Canton children to attend at a reduced tuition or no tuition.

The 42-acre-farm includes a barn with 15 horse stalls, a horse shed, a chicken house and a four-bedroom house. Livestock on the farm would be included in the deal, Marts said. He presently has 42 horses, two cows, geese, ducks, chickens, sheep and

"They could walk into a very good program," Marts said of the township. "All I'd like to hear from them is, 'Hey we're a little bit interested.' Then they could have the property appraised. I'm not asking them to just take my word for it.

Marts cited Camp Dearborn, saying the administration could charge outof-town people who use the facility when there's an opening. He said

other communities do the same thing with their municipal ice rinks.

ASKED WHY he wants out of a business which he says earned \$28,468 last year, Marts replied that he is 53 years. old and wants to head south to raise race horses

"The thrust of my proposal-the whole thing-is that if people are going to invest in houses in Canton they should have something diverse in their community to help improve the overall environment. If they're going to go back to their houses and that's that, then I'm concerned about the quality of life in Canton.

"Something like this would provide all types of recreation for residents."

Programs that could be run by the township, said Marts, include a summer day camp, a riding school, adult riding program, a 4-H club for Canton children using the farm's animals; a horse club for residents; and overnight camping and picnicking.

"All of these programs can be ac complished in one year with no capital outlay," claims Marts. "DPW equipment and manpower can provide the initial work to make the necessary changes to implement this program. I must remind the board that the cost of operation is provided by tuition.

Canton board members received Marts's proposal last week, but there has been no move to officially re-





Restaurants as old as the Bible

The history of public eating service is probably as ancient as the Old Testament, which frequently refers to inns

"Restaurant" has its origin in the Latin root word, "restauare" which means "to restore." In the 16th century, this Latin root word was applied to a spicy broth and called a "restorative beverage.

Later it was applied to other "restorative" foods, especially gravy, soups, bouillons and similar preparations

The honor for creating the first "businessmen's lunch" apparently belongs to a chap named Segius Locates, a Roman innkeeper in 40 B.C. He devised the feature for ship brokers who were too busy to go

Some authorities claim that the "medieval" history of the restaurant industry began during the French revolution, in 1789, when hiding aristocrats were fed in secret by their servants. These rendezvous became known to other aristocrats who were willing to pay a small charge for well-cooked meals.

IN ANCIENT times, there were places for public eating roughly similar to our reastaurants, before the dawn of civilization, when people began making their homes in one place and occasionally traveling away from home—as distinguished from nomads who had no real homes-they needed a place to eat and sleep enroute. Thus early restaurants were usually in conjunction with sleeping accomodations.

Inn, hotels and monasteries of Europe served this function up to the 17th century and today's restaurant is really an cutgrowth of these. Its development as a separate institution came later.

One of the earliest restaurants was the Tabard Inn in London, where, in the 14th century, Chaucer's Canterbury pilgrimsused to gather prior to their journeys to the shrine of St. Thomas Becket, to dine and revel. They also held dinners there after they returned, at which time the best teller of stories during the pilgrimage was rewarded with a free meal and feted.

This was the idea of the inn host, Harry Bailey, who went along on the trips to judge the best tales.

In England, commoners had patronized eating places called "ordinary" as far back as 1577. These were taverns which served only at specified mealtimes-usually between one and four o'clock-at a long, common table and at a fixed price. Diners couldn't come in any time, sit any place or choose from a vast menu.

A NOTED ordinary frequented by literary figures in the 17th century was the Castle Ordinary. It burned down in 1666 and was rebuilt as Dolly's Chop House. The latter gained renown when "Dolly" introduced pretty serving maids instead of waiters.

Dolly's Chop House was famed for choice of beefsteaks and ales. Fielding, Defoe, Swift, Dryden, Pope, Gainsborough and Handel were steady customers of this chop house.

When coffee was introduced to Europe, the restaurant function was taken over by coffee houses which were popular i England from the 17th century on. In France, the "cafe" (coffee) arose. The first English coffee house was in St. Michaels Alley, Cornhill, owned by a Greek named Pasqua Rosee, who was the first to teach the method of roasting coffee and to introduce it in England.

The first public eating place to be designated as a restaurant was opened in Paris in 1765. It was called Le Champ d'Oiseau and its proprietor was a gentleman called Boulanger

Over the doorway was a Latin inscription: Venite ad me omnes qui stomacho laboratis et ego restaurabo vos-"Come to me all whose stomachs cry out in anguish and I shall restore you.'

In the United States, the earliest restaurants were patterned after their English and Continental counterparts-wayside inns, coffee houses and taverns during the colonial period. Some of the better-known were the Blue Anchor Tavern in Philadelphia, open in 1683, Ye Coffee House. also in Philadelphia, 1700, and Ye Crown Coffee House of Boston, 1711.

In the 19th century, a new wealthy class arose and elaborate restaurants and dining rooms in better hotels gradually game to be. The leisure class began to consider din-

ing in pleasant surroundings away from home "the" thing to do and thus, the era of famous caterers, restauranteurs and chefs began.

THE FIRST restaurant proper was Delmonico's, which opened in lower New York in 1827. Lorenzo Delmonico, who came from Switzerland to join the confectionery business in New York, suggested to his firm that they open a restaurant to serve food in the European style. This marked the beginning of a trend toward lavish restaurants which flourished in major cities, coast to coast, until the end of the Gay Nineties.

Louis Sherry opened his first unit the year Delmonico died. The two were outstanding in the United States. He put special emphasis on extravagantly satisfying individual tastes of his patrons and was famed for elaborate catering projects.

Sherry once took three railroad cars of equipment and personnel from New York to Savannah, Ga., for a a single meal.

It took a revolution to bring restaurants within the financial reach of all. In this case, it was the industrial revolution which began in the 1880s, sending increasing numbers of men and women into factories and offices. They had to be fed quickly and inexpensively. To meet this need, the first cafeteria was opened in New York in 1885 and was soon followed by others in Chicago and the West.

The overwhelming success of the selfservice cafeteria idea pointed out the nationwide demand for low-cost meals. Notable in its development was the John R. Thompson Co., Chicago, which opened a small self-service establishment in that city in 1891.

This unit with its array of easy-to-eat hot dishes and the characteristic one-arm chair-with a widened arm to serve as a table-rapidly grew into a chain of selfservice facilities in and around Chicago.

THE EARLY cafeterias were designed with the needs of the working class in mind, as opposed to the first service restaurants, which catered to the wealthy.

After World War I, the increase in number of restaurants was partly due to growth in automobile use. Roadside eating places grew up. In cities, eating places were developed to serve factory and business people who couldn't go home for lunch. The need to feed many people in a short time spurred development of special restaurant techniques

In August 1919, the Volstead Act became law and ended the legitimate sale of alcoholic beverages. The "great experiment," that was to end 13 years later, had a powerful impact on the restaurant industry.

"Free lunches" were abolished and the saloons that had served a bountiful array of foods purely as a side attraction were replaced with restaurants which swiftly made the discovery that good food could in itself produce good profits

During the 1930s, the repeal of Prohibi tion proved a boon to the industry.

IN AN EFFORT to mobilize industry to battle the Depression, the U.S. Government instituted the National Recovery Act. This act required each industry to prepare a code of fair competition and the National Restaurant Association quickly submitted an acceptable code for restaurants. Although the National Recovery Act was ultimately declared unconstitutional, the country slowly pulled itself out of the Depres-

In the 1940s, World War II reached the shores of the United States. The shortages of equipment and foods, the lack of employees, the overnight rise in patronage-these are just a few of the problems which beset the restaurant industry during those hectic

Every resource which the industry could muster was needed. The industry's talents were used to feed troops and factory work-

From 20 million meals a day, restaurants saw their volume rocket to 40 million, and then 60 million, and some estimates say that restaurants were serving as many as 75 million meals a day at the height of the war-time demand for restau-

At the close of World War II, many changes occurred. The industry reached new highs in everything. In a three-year period, 75,000 new businesses were born.

Today, the food-service industry is the largest retail employer in the United States, currently employing more eight million men and women, both full and part time, in more establishments than any other retail business in America

APPROXIMATELY 500,000 existing food-service units exist to provide meals away from home during the day or night.

Because there are so many food-service establishments, the industry is perceived as being one of small business. In many ways, this is true. But the image of smallness belies the fact that, in 1975, industry sales totaled over \$72 billion-ranking fourth in the retail sales category.

This year, food-service sales will reach \$80 billion and, within two years, the industry expects to operate at an annual reate of \$100 billion a year.

Today one of every three dollars spent for food is spent for food away from home. In the near future, 40 percent of all food expenditures will flow into the food service

Whatever it is, the roar of airplane engines and the rock and roll of a ship just can't beat the rhythm of the rails. To wit, think back to "Murder on the Orient Express" or "The Lady Vanishes." "Silver Streak" (PG) carries on this fine tradition. In fact, it lays new tracks.

THIS MOVIE LIVES UP to its advertisements. It really is a comedy-suspense thriller-terrific entertainment.

Foremost among the reasons for its success is the superb casting. Each actor hits exactly the right note in defining his character. The excellent acting, gorgeous photography (including beautiful panoramic views of the American West) and original situations keep this movie snapping along from its risque beginning to its smash ending.

Gene Wilder as George Caldwell, editor for a publishing house, is perfect as the innocent bystander caught up in art swindles, murder and mayhem.

Jill Clayburgh is Hildy Burns, a lithe and horny secretary to an art historian. She has the compartment adjoining George's. They've only a broken lock between them and, sometimes, less than that.

FOR ANYONE out of Dr.: Denton's, the scene between George and Hildy when they make love while discussion gardening (he edits gardening books and sex manuals) has to be one of the most memorable movie seductions.

The promise of an X-rated train ride to Chicago is abruptly denied when George becomes witness to a murder. You know all hell will break loose then, and it does. It emanates from the icy, calm presence of Patrick McGoohan as the heavy, Roger Devereau. His flawless grooming, impeccable diction and suave manners betoken how ruthless and cunning

Devereau has made a bundle with forged paintings and false authentications. He has Hildy's employer killed because the professor was going to expose his activities. The evidence that would substantiate the charges consists of original letters written by the 17th-century Dutch painter Rembrandt

The professor hid the letters, and in the frantic search for them, two other people get killed, and George gets tossed off the train. He reaches the office of a hick sheriff, but the sheriff is completely boggled by George's account of events. When he hears about the Rembrandt letters, he asks, "Who's

'Rembrandt's dead," answers George. "Who killed Rembrandt?" gasps the sheriff, mentally adding still another mur-

During one of his forced exits from the train. George steals a police car wherein he meets Richard Pryor, on his way to the slammer for indulging in a little free enterprise. Pryor perks up, and often steals, every scene in which he appears. As Grover Muldoon, his brashness and street savvy are the perfect foils for George's middle-class innocence. Pryor and Wilder together have to be two of the most winsome personalities on the screen.

And win they do—with the help of federal agents. They eventually get back on the train, then off again-sort of. It's all in a good cause, an inventive and spectacular smash ending that does the special effects department proud.

Tire slashers set free by the juvenile court

There is a new bumper sticker gaining popularity in the Livonia police depart-

ment's vouth bureau. The sticker carries the message: "Criminals' best friend- your local judge-easy

bail-no jail. The reason for the sticker's popularity is a recent Wayne County Juvenile Court action which freed one of three teenagers who pled guilty and admitted taking part in an expensive tire slashing spree last

The boy was among three juveniles who admitted to the slashing along with a young adult, Milton Trombley, 19, of 9271

Two of the juveniles are from Plymouth with the third from Redford Township.

The tire slashings took place in a subdivision and apartment complex in southwest Livonia. The vandalism amounted to \$3,000 in damages to nearly 30 cars, police

WHAT IS UPSETTING the youth bureau is that one of the juveniles admitted to the slashing and the juvenie court refused to accept the guilty plea, instead issuing a warning to the boy and his parents and dismissing the case.

The bureau had information that he same was done for all three juveniles, but the juvenile court said that only one had his case dismissed. The other two juveniles will have their cases continued until future hearings, set for January.

'Where is the deterent?" asked Sgt. Alfred Emrick of the youth bureau. "I'm very upset. The court is destroying youths by the way it is handling them. Teenagers are laughing up their sleeves.

Emrich said that possibly the maximum age of juveniles handled by the juvenile courts should be lowered from its present level of 16 years old

"We're not talking of little Johnny taking candy from a store or throwing a rock through a window," Emrich said. "There

must be a just and sure punishment.' The youth bureau officer was also perturbed that a homeowner who was subpoenaed as the key witness in the juvenile court hearing refused to testify because Emrich said, he was fixing his car at

The officer noted that homeowners publicly criticized the police department for failing to solve the problem when the vandalism was reported last summer.

PRENTIS EDWARDS, juvenile court registrar, responded to the youth bureau's comments, saying that a court referee who made the decision about the teenager involved in the slashing had a wide variety of options, including issuing a warning and dismissing the case

He said that the teenager's admission of guilt must be voluntary and meet state Supreme Court standards.

'The juvenile court has a wide range of dispositions in any case," Edwards said. "If court supervision is felt not needed, then a warning is given and the case is dis-

"This is done based on financial restitutions and the juvenile's personal background and his family's background." Edwards said that sometimes the juve-

nile is referred to a private social agency a petter job than the juve-

Other options juvenile court referees have are placing the youth on probation or putting him or her in an institution. Edwards also indicated another problem

with getting accurate information-or any information-from the juvenile court. By law, the court can't release any information about its cases. This not only includes names but also the status of cases

when the names are already obtained by newspapers from police departments. During the telephone interview, Edwards refused to discuss the dismissal of the boy involved in the Livonia vandalism incident, but did confirm that only one of the three cases had been dismissed so far-not all three as first reported by the youth bu-

Edwards also declined to provide the name of the juvenile referee handling the cases, repeating the law which provides for confidentiality of juvenile files.

Nearly 60 Swedish parents and teenagers are spending two weeks in Plymouth as part of a cultural hockey exchange program. The Swedes arrived via airplane one week ago and are staying either with Plymouth families or in local hotels.

Similar exchange programs with hockey teams are popular throughout the state because the winter sport is played all around the world. Two years ago, a group of Swedes came to Plymouth to play hockey and sample American lifestyles.

Since then, the program has expanded to an annual affair with the two hockey teams alternating as host. Last year, Plymouth youngsters and their parents visited Sweden during the holidays. While most parents stayed in Swedish hotels, the youngsters were housed by the Swedes.

For the most part, Plymouth families are housing the same youths their children stayed with last year. Ever since the exchange program began in 1974, the young hockey players have maintained correspondence with one

and played their first game on Tuesday night in Ann Arbor. During the game, Rolf Bjork, who is staying with the Tom Norton family on Tavistock, suffered a broken collarbone. Rolf received a hard body check and hit the boards the wrong way.

He was rushed to St. Joseph Hospital in Ann Arbor, where he was X. raved and taped up. On Wedneway, an orthopedic surgeon in nounced Rolfk fit. The 16-year-cl. will be sidelined for six weeks but will accompany his team on the remainder of its

Tom Norton said he has detected little difference between his son Tom Jr. and Swedish boys like Rolf. "He has a healthy appetite and loves pizza and MacDonald's just like our boys,' Norton said.

The Nortons aren't adjusting their lifestyles at all because they want to give Rolf an accurate view of their living habits. Rolf asks questions and sometimes gets confused by the English language. But for the most part, he comprehends all that surrounds him here.

ROLF'S PARENTS didn't accompany him here so they have yet to be isn't severe, the Nortons will let the travel agency take care of contacting Rolf's family.

The Snyder family on Auburn is housing Hans Lihammer of Stockholm and both of his parents. Mr. and Mrs. Pie Snyder went on the trip to Sweden . with their son Dairy last year.

Barry keptin touch with Hans after staying with the Lihammers last year. To acquaint the Lihammers with their living habits, the Snyder family isn't doing anything out of the ordinary. They served a Christmas dinner with turkey and all the trim-

Pie Snyder said the families have a lot of free time to spend with one another outside of the scheduled hockey games and group tours. Shopping at Fairlane and Briarwood, snowmobiling and, at the request of the Lihammers, ice fishing, are among the activities that will be pursued during leisure hours.

THE SNYDERS and the Lihammers have had few communication problems. Nils Lihammer lived in Ohio for a while, and Hans studies English in shoool. Both families say they are enjoying the experience.

The Kennedy family on Umberland is housing three Swedish youngsters and a coach. Bill Kennedy, who plays on a Plymouth Midget-A hockey team, said only a few habits have changed around the house since their Swedish visitors moved in.

"Outside of some extra cleaning, things have stayed the same. We eat the same dinners, but breakfast has become a little more extravagant. Instead of fixing ourselves a bowl of cereal, my mother makes big breakfasts," Bill said.

A long list of tours are lined up for the Swedish guests this week Tuesday. Plymouthites will lead their foreign friends to Greenfield Village and the Stroh brewery in Detroit.

Thursday, they will spend a day with the Detroit Red Wings. They'll see the Wings practice in the morning, eat lunch with the players and see the Detroit-Minnesota game at

BUT THE BIG game will be Friday night when both the Midgel (15- and 16-year-olds) and Bantam (13- and 14year-olds) teams from Plymouth and Sweden face off at the Cultural Center arena. A banquet will follow

The Swedes will head home Saturday afternoon.

The 1977 membership campaign of the American Diabetes Association, Michigan Affiliate is in full swing, with several builtin incentives offered by merchants in the metropolitan area to card-carrying mem-

The 43 Perry Drug Stores in Michigan give members a 10 per cent discount on all purchases of insuling syringes, oral hypoglycemic agents and diabetes testing supplies through 1977.

Dexter Chevrolet, at 20811 Eight Mile Detroit, and Skalnek Ford, at 941 South Lapeer in Lake Orion, both offer 1977 models for \$100 over cost.

And Lums Restaurants offer coupons to be used in paying for meals.

The annual campaign begins immediately after National Diabetes Month, every November, when free diabetes tests are offered throughout the state

The most important reason for having a campaign is to help us toward our goal of finding a cure." said Richard Brockmeir of ADA-M.

"THE MEMBERSHIP now stands at

more than 2,000, but the campaign is dedicated to finding the 250,000 known diabetics in Michigan and supplying them with a periodic flow of information.

'We are particularly concerned," he continued. "with those who have been diagnosed as having a 'mild' case of diabetes. These are diabetics who may control their condition through oral medication, or sometimes through proper diet alone.'

He explained that in some cases a diabetic who has escaped the necessity of taking insulin will often, falsely, assume they are cured and no longer seek medical at-

"Regular visits to a physician are important," he said. "not only to detect any changes in the diabetic's condition, but also because they serve as an incentive. People will usually take better care of themselves and adhere more strictly to their diets if they have regular check-ups and reports from their doctor." Brockmeier said.

The association says that the better informed a diatetic is, the better he or she is able to keep the disease under control, and delay or minimize the serious complications such as blindness, heart disease and kidney failure.

"That's because proper diet and exercise are as important as the proper insulin dosage." stated Dr. Brockmeier.

TO KEEP MEMBERS informed, ADA-M provides six issues of "Forcast," its national publication: "Michigan Diabetes News," a quarterly newsletter; and notices about local meetings and educational programs.

Membership dues are \$10. Persons may secure a membership card by writing to American Diabetes Association, Michigan Affiliate, Inc 6131 West Outer Drive, Detroit, 48235

mother's fault The 10-day measles are back and this time it's not just a childhood disease. Recent outbreaks throughout the country are affecting more teenagers and young adults

than ever before Dr David Goldfinger, medical consultant for Combined Insurance Company of America's claims department, says that one of the resons the disease is spreading among older children is that many mothers thought their young children had

mesles when they really didn't and therefore thought immunization unnecessary.

'Unless you're 101 per cent sure that a doctor diagnosed the disease as measles. get a vaccination," he said.

Measles symptoms are often mistaken with those of a severe cold-fever, redness and watering of the eyes, nasal discharge and congestion. Spots don't appear until three or four days after the fever has subsided. Although measles is highly contagious, it's usually a mild illness but can

give rise to complications involving the brain and lungs.

Dr. Goldfinger also attributes the in crese to the fact that the first vaccine de veloped and administered from 1963 to 1969 was not as effective as the one currently in use. "There is no harm in getting re-im-

munized with the new vaccine." he said The U.S. Center for Disease Contol projects continued outbreaks. Their 1975 statistics indicate 23,000 cases, in 1976 there were 37,000 reported cases.

We had only three or four practices to get ready. There was no thinking or plan-

We didn't know what was going on. It was a humiliating thing. It was worse than mediocrity." But when the 1974 season came around,

things changed. The players were better, the schedule was better and the coach was better. The result was an 11-4 season.

Hatcher had taken over the varsity duties and Way spent her time with the junior varsity. Way's prime interest was the new girls' softball program forming at the Centennial Park.

Hatcher began taking graduate courses at Eastern MichigaN University for teachers with no major in coaching. Since then she has learned more about the specifics of the game. She has set up a solid weight program for the girls and a rugged preseason conditioning program that includes

practice on the court and conversation in the classroom with a variety of chalk-

The other important ingredient to Salem's success has been the over-whelming talent of girls. Both Salem and Canton are blessed with experienced athletes that have played the game for a number of years in the junior athletic program

where every girl was a player. The entire team was serious about the sport and willing and anxious to work hard.


'They were devoted to athletics but they were versatile. They were not narrow minded girls.

And these will not be gimmick cars displayed soley to attract attention or strange vehicles trotted out for public admiration. The participating dealers will be showing cars that a visitor

That's the idea. If you like a car, the dealer might well sell it right off the mall floor, said Jack Crissman, president of the Tel-Twelve Auto Dealers' Association.

Last year, more than 100 cars were sold at the show, he said.

Representatives and salesmen will be at the show each week day and Saturday during the day. Dealers will be taking orders at the show.

Some nearby dealers will be offering specials where the customer can complete the deal at the showroom, within walking distance of the mall. The show will run during regular mall hours, 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily and noon to 5 p.m. Sunday.

Last year, more than 300,000 people visited the mall during the 10-day auto show. Crissman expects this year's attendence to be even greater.
