## Supreme court won't hear road patrol suit

The final chapter appeared to have been written in the Wayne County sheriff's road patrol battle when the Michigan Supreme Court last week denied an appeal by eight western townships.

The townships contended the county has a legal obligation to provide road patrol service.

The high court's unanimous decision in effect threw out the townships' case without hearing it, letting stand

the decisions of the Michigan Court of Appeals and Wayne County Circuit Judge Thomas Foley.

COUNTY FUNDING of the road patrol is destined to end June 30.

The townships have several options: 1) to contract with the sheriff's office and pay for the road patrol; 2) to start their own police departments individually; or 3) to form joint departments.

A county board spokesman said most townships are expected to begin negotiations to contract for the service. The City of Romulus several years ago disbanded its own police department and hired the sheriff's road patrol.

Eight townships in northern Oakland County also make contracts with the sheriff for patrol service.

The Wayne County sheriff's road patrol in the townships currently con-

sists of a 28-man unit. The county board of commissioners has funded it at \$637,000 for a seven-month period while awaiting outcome of the townships' court appeal.

Affected are the townships of Brownstown, Canton, Huron, Northville, Plymouth, Sumpter and Van Buren.

Their suit, seeking a court order to force county funding, was filed in 1974, but the issue has been hanging

over the county's head for five years.

IN POLITICAL terms, the issue is a classic rural-urban dispute.

Eight townships with less than four per cent of Wayne County's population are the only beneficiaries of road patrol sheriff, but the entire county pays for it. Thus, residents of cities and townships which have their own police forces pay for a service they don't receive.

Foley's decision said the townships don't have a legal right to road patrol service, and the level of funding is up to the collective wisdom of the board of commissioners, the county's legislative body.

The decision does not affect other Wayne County sheriff services—the regular patrol of county roads, park patrols, the marine patrol and the Metropolitan Airport patrol.

## Final court ruling will force a police decision

The Michigan Supreme Court's upholding Thursday of a lower court's ruling which said out-county townships have to pay for the Wayne County Sheriff's Road Patrol caught local officials by surprise.

Both Harold Stein, Canton Township supervisor, and Thomas Notebaert, supervisor of Plymouth Township, said they were caught somewhat off-guard by the state high court's refusal to hear the appeal of the Michigan Court of Appeals ruling.

Although neither supervisor was unduly upset by the decision, they both indicated they didn't know what would happen as a result of the ruling.

"It doesn't shake me up at all," remarked Stein. "It never has bothered me. We'll still get police protection out here."

The Wayne County Sheriff's patrols

aren't going to pull out immediately. They're funded through June 30.

Stein said although there had been talk of negotiating an independent contract with the county if the appeal was rejected, nothing definite had been decided.

He said he had been studying the problem of police protection for a year and mentioned the Canton Police Study Committee, which has been looking at the issue since the first of the year. He added he would not make a decision about Canton's next move until the committee's recommendations were known.

"But don't worry," he said "I could implement a full-time police department in five minutes if I had to. We haven't been sleeping out here, you know."

Canton started its reserve police department after the townships lost the case in circuit court, as a contingency measure if the appeals failed, and to augment the county and state police coverage of the township.

ALTHOUGH PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP did not begin its own police department, the county board's decision resulted in township officials asking for millage for a police department.

But the request was turned down by the voters last August.

Notebaert made reference to the defeat, when he talked about the township's alternatives. "Because the citizens did not grant the millage, I have to assume they are satisfied with the protection they have been receiving from the sheriff."

"I, too, have to say that I have no complaint with our police protection so far. But if we are going to pay for it, we are going to get good service."

Notebaert admitted that if the county tried to charge exorbitant rates, he would possibly re-open the question of a township police department.

BERT BURGOYNE, the attorney who has been handling the seven township's appeal was infuriated by the supreme court's refusal to hear the case.

"The townships are—out of luck, and it's too bad. We've never even had a hearing on the merits of the case. The trial court said the townships had to pay and the appeals court affirmed the decision. And the Supreme Court wouldn't even hear it."

"Criminals can get all the appeals they want, but not the townships. If I were the townships, I'd tell the county to go to hell, and get my own police department."

## Kelley looks into legality of ZBA

Five deposed members of the prior Canton Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) have prompted Michigan Attorney General Frank Kelley to research a legal opinion to determine if their appointments were valid or not.

A spokesman in the attorney gener-

al's office said they were looking into the matter and expected to have an opinion by the end of the month.

ZBA chairman Jim Donahue lost his seat on the ZBA along with fellow board members Robert Greenstein, Tom Quinn, John Burdzak and Robert Miller. Their dismissal came after the township's law firm, Sempliner, Thomas and Guth, ruled that the ZBA appointments were "null and void" because Canton's zoning ordinance conflicts with mandatory state statute.

Last year Public Act 131 mandated all municipalities with a population of 5,000 or more to appoint at least five people to the ZBA. Canton appointed five people to the ZBA near the end of Greenstein's term of office but never changed the ordinance which still called for a three-member zoning board.

Therefore, William Sempliner ruled that the appointments and the zoning board were null and void because the local ordinance didn't agree with state statute.

LAST MONTH, on Jan. 25, the Canton Board of Trustees voted to adopt a new ordinance which calls for a five-member board. Last Tuesday the board appointed five people to replace Donahue, Greenstein, Quinn, Burdzak and Miller.

Even before they were officially ousted from Canton's zoning board, Donahue and Greenstein contacted state senator William Faust's office in

## Decision Tuesday on hall site

One of two sites under consideration for construction of the \$2.7 million township administration building is expected to be selected by the board of trustees tomorrow (Tuesday) night.

The old Folker's Nursery property, west of Canton Center and north of Proctor, bought by the township last year for projected recreational expansion, is one possibility. The site north of Fire-Meeting Hall No. 1 is the second site being seriously considered.

Supervisor Harold Stein has already gone on record as being strongly in favor of the old nursery site. Trustees on the board such as Brian Schwall and Lynne Goldsmith had reservations about the nursery site in previous discussion.

Because the old nursery site is located on the west side of Canton Center Road—the physical and philosophi-

cal dividing line of Canton—Schwall fears development will spread too rapidly once sewers are introduced to the southwest portion of the township.

Stein said last week that these fears are unfounded because the sewer line will not extend west down Proctor Road and will only service the municipal building if the site is chosen.

"It just makes sense to build the hall on land we already own, rather than going out and spending \$100,000 for 12 acres of land we don't own," Stein said. "Why won't they listen to reason? They keep yelling about how if we build it there we're providing sewers for development to the west."

Clerk John Flodin said he has made his mind up about which site he prefers, but didn't want to make his preference known and possibly influence undecided colleagues.

Previously, Flodin said he was

"leaning toward" favoring the site north of the fire hall.

Asked about the worries about opening the west to further home development, Flodin replied, "There is a risk, I suppose."

"But the Canton Township board can exercise a degree of control over what goes there (in the west). Even if everyone was in agreement that the west should be developed, I'd ask, 'Is there sewer capacity for any of that property west of Canton Center?'"

Treasurer Anne Bradley is expected to vote to build on the nursery site in what most officials predict to be a very close decision.

FORMER TRUSTEE James Poole has submitted a request for a Class C liquor license that appears on Tuesday's board agenda.

Poole said that the agenda item is

merely a formality to place his application "on file with the other 400 requests for a liquor license." Poole said that back in 1972 he had made an application for a liquor license but withdrew that application when he ran for office.

"I'm proposing to build a restaurant-bar with a western style decor," Poole said. "I've got a couple names I'm considering—'Canton Canteen' or 'Canton's Cantina'. I have the location on Ford Road east of the 1-275 expressway and I have some pictures, but I haven't completed the engineering and architecture."

STEIN has requested in the agenda that board members consider adopting a "resolution of agreement in principle" to help form an Economic Development Corporation (EDC) in Canton to attract business.

## Minority are chronic skippers

Plymouth Salem and Canton high school officials' biggest concern these days focuses on the 7-10 per cent of students considered chronic skippers.

This segment of the student body is on the verge of dropping out of school. Their cases involve teachers, parents, counselors, area coordinators and, if necessary, the courts.

Sometimes numbering as many as 400, students missing more than eight classes in one course per semester are classified as potentially serious problems. But the real worry is with the students cutting more classes than they attend.

When declared a serious problem, a student will often be placed in the Student-Teacher Planning (STP) program. It requires that the two parties confer at the start of every week in determining how to fill a student's free time between classes.

STP RELIES on an honor system, however, as no real checks are made on whether students follow their schedules.

If a violation of STP is detected, a student will then be placed on a structured schedule, intended to force him to attend class by producing teacher signatures.

The more rigid schedule also has its limitations. "Structured scheduling is only as efficient as parents want it to be," said Kent Buikema, principal at Canton High School. "It is their responsibility to insure that the student is acquiring authentic signatures."

If structured scheduling proves ineffective, students are sometimes put on a two- or three-day suspension. This action is taken to inform parents of the magnitude of the problem and possibly make an impact on the student, if not his peers, Buikema said.

The high schools employ several

full-time professionals to help deal with the chronic skipper. "We're better equipped than most schools to handle serious absentee problems," Buikema said.

"WE HAVE full-time area coordinators, a social worker and a school psychologist, in addition to a new attendance supervisor. This doesn't mean that we're going to resolve all the problems, but at least we know we're giving it our best shot."

If the attendance problem persists after consultation with the schools' various professionals, the remaining alternatives are numbered.

Students under 16 years old are sometimes sent before a judge in juvenile court. The schools will only go to court out of sheer frustration, according to Buikema. Involving the courts force parents to get involved and threaten underclassmen with the possibility of being put in a juvenile home.

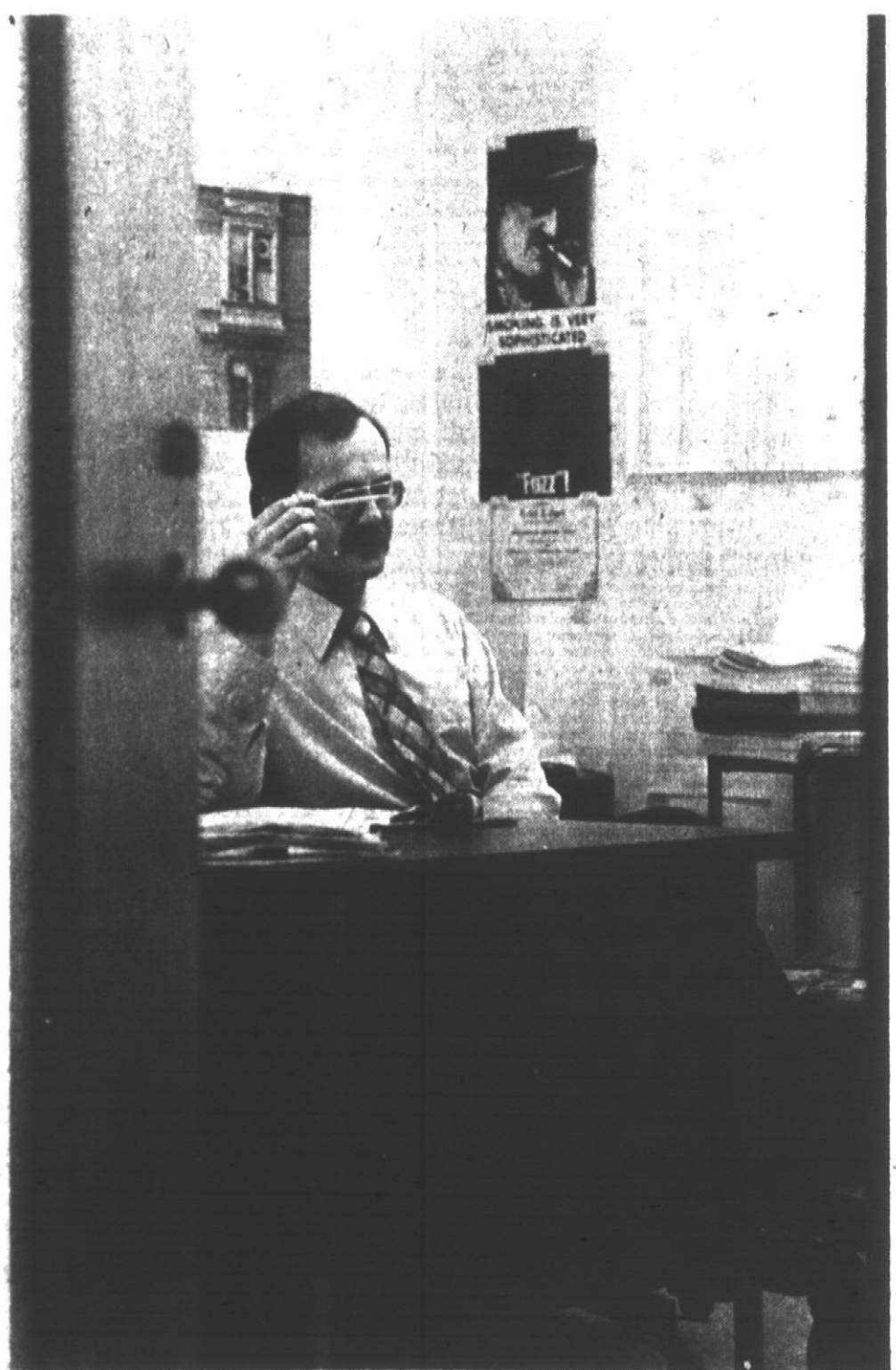
For those older than 16, however, all efforts are made to satisfy the student. "We rarely close the door on a problem student," said Dick Bearup, Salem area coordinator. "We'll try to find students a job, look into night school or other possibilities to occupy their time."

"If a student is still in deep water, then the school will either suggest parents voluntarily withdraw their student or recommend he be expelled," Buikema said.

"NEITHER SALEM nor Canton have ever expelled a student for attendance problems," said Bill Brown, Salem principal. "If we can avoid expelling a student, we will."

"No school does more in putting up with serious attendance problems than we do. A high percentage of drop-outs come back in September asking for one more chance and we give it to them."

Bearup estimates that nearly one-

# Moving of water tower may get state honor

The plan and design for the moving of the LakePointe water tower in Plymouth Township, considered one of the outstanding engineering feats in the suburban area, has been nominated for honors in the annual Engineering Excellence Awards Competition sponsored by the Consulting Engineers Council.

The entire project, in which the huge tower was moved 500 feet, was engineered by Brender-Hamill and Associates, Inc. of Plymouth. The move was made necessary because it was located in the route of the M-14 expressway extension.

"The project is novel because the moving of a tower of this size, with a capacity of 400,000 gallons weighing 150 tons and 135 feet high, had never been done before," said Stephen M. Wagner, executive director of the Consulting Engineers Council of Michigan, Inc.

THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT of State Highways and Transportation obtained and paid for the site, adjacent to the expressway, to which the tower was moved.

The prime contractor for moving the tank was Ministrelli Construction Co. of Novi. The engineering projects competition is being held in conjunction with National Engineers Week, Feb. 20-26.

The winners in the competition will be announced Feb. 22. The projects will be recognized at an awards banquet Feb. 26 at the Fairlane Manor in Dearborn.

# Dr. Pino buried today

Dr. Ralph H. Pino, M.D., former longtime Plymouth resident and nationally known eye specialist, died Thursday at University Hospital, Ann Arbor.

Funeral services will be held today (Monday) at 11 a.m. from Bell Chapel of the William R. Hamilton Co., 820 E. Maple, Birmingham, with burial at Roseland Park Cemetery in Berkley.

DR. PINO owned the property known as Plymouth Colony Farms at the corner of Ann Arbor Trail and Ann Arbor Road for 40 years.

Many residents still remember the summer outdoor concerts held there from 1957-59 by the Plymouth Symphony. Pino also had remained active in the Plymouth Grange as chairman of its health committee.

He was a former chief of the department of ophthalmology at Harper Hospital, and served as medical director of sight-saving and braille in Detroit Schools for 20 years. Pino set up and administered the first remedial reading program at Wayne State University.

Pino was a past president of the Wayne County Medical Society and of the Detroit Ophthalmological Society. He had been a delegate to Michigan State Medical Society for more than 30 years and was professor emeritus of ophthalmology at Wayne State University College of Medicine.

PINO RETIRED from active practice in 1959 after 40 years of private practice in the David Whitney Building.

Born July 4, 1888 on a farm in Clinton County, Mich., Pino taught in rural schools after attending Central State Teachers College. He graduated from Ferris Institute in 1911 and earned his MD in 1916 from the University of Illinois. Dr. Pino did post graduate work at the University of Vienna, and the universities of Colorado, Illinois, and New York.

He was author of numerous scientific articles, and recipient of many distinguished awards for his educational and teaching activities; for leadership in the health careers movement; and for being a long-time promoter of the use of medical technicians. In 1958 he was awarded an honorary doctor of science degree from Ferris State College and has been included in "Who's Who in America" since 1938.

Survivors include: wife, Grace; four grandchildren; and one great-grandchild. Tributes may be sent to Alumni House, Ferris State College, Big Rapids, Mich. 49307.

# Deputies give a lift to eyes

What do members of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department do when they're not pursuing thieves, tracking down murder suspects or patrolling the county's streets?

The transporting of human eyes seems an unlikely pastime for the county law enforcement officers.

But that's exactly what two sheriff deputies did last week, when they picked up a pair of eyes at Detroit Metropolitan Airport and transported them to Harper Hospital for an emergency eye transplant operation.

"We've transported eyes, rare blood

and salk (polio) vaccine," said Inspector Robert Sullivan of the sheriff's department. "It's a humanitarian thing, and it's got to be done."

DEBRA WAGENMAN, executive director of the Wayne State University division of the Michigan Eye Bank, says her agency calls on the Sheriff's Department from time to time to transport eyes shipped from one of the 69 eye banks across the nation.

Packed in refrigerated boxes, the eyes are rushed to Harper Hospital in emergency cases for a patient who will lose his eyesight within 48 hours without a cornea transplant operation.

The cornea—a transparent sliver of tissue covering the iris and pupil—is the only portion of the eye which can be transplanted, but Mrs. Wagenman said the entire eyeball is often shipped for purposes of the transplant operations.

The cornea is removed from the rest of the eye in the operating room. The eyeball, packaged in a refrigerated, "moist storage chamber," will keep for 24 hours.

Other corneas, Mrs. Wagenman said, are removed from the eye before they are shipped and immersed in a vial of fluid. Corneas packed in the "MK media" will keep for about four days.

ALTHOUGH ANYONE can donate their eyes to science, Mrs. Wagenman says only about half of the corneas donated are suitable for transplant. The rest are used for research.

"The age of the donor doesn't matter," she said of corneas suitable for transplant, "and there is no typing of tissue. What does matter is the donor's cause of death and the health of the cornea."

An infection killed a donor may have entered the cornea or damaged the eye, she explained. A donor who spent his last days on a respirator, for example, probably suffered a loss of reflexes and a slower blinking rate would dry and damage the cornea.

According to Mrs. Wagenman, only about 10 per cent of the patients who suffer from blindness have diseased or defective corneas. Of the patients who undergo a cornea transplant operation, 80 per cent regain at least some portion of their vision.

The transplant operation, she said, is very "delicate" and takes about an hour.

The WSU division of the Michigan Eye Bank receives about 200 corneas from donors a year. There is a shortage of eyes this year, however, Mrs. Wagenman said, and about 50 visually-impaired Michigan residents are waiting for cornea donations.

## Segovia praises Sunday's soloist

Guillermo Fierens, Argentinian classical guitarist and protégé of Andres Segovia, will be Sunday's soloist with the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra.

In describing Fierens' artistry, Segovia enthusiastically said, "His technique is magnificent. He runs through the more intricate passages with intrepid fingers that don't miss a note, and he possesses, besides, something more valuable than the mere mechanism—emotion."

"He feels what he interprets and is able to communicate this feeling to his listeners. Everyone with a musical sensitivity will remember listening to him. I am pleased to announce his triumph."

Each season he performs throughout western Europe from Spain, France and Italy in the south to Sweden, Norway and Finland in the north.

Following a performance in Paris, he was described in *Musique Critique* as a "stunning guitarist, in the line of great guitarists his name is inscribed in precious metals and gold."

HOW DID THE Plymouth Symphony attract a musician who had three sell-out concerts in a 12-month period in Lisbon?

Wayne Dunlap, conductor of the orchestra, arranged the appearance to coincide with Fierens' annual teaching stint at Grand Valley State College. Dunlap is director of fine arts at GVSC.

Guillermo Fierens made his Michigan debut five years ago in Grand Rapids. He accepted an invitation to teach in the school of music at Grand Valley and returns each year.

The city has a special attraction for the musician. His brother, Enrique Fierens MD, is director of cardiac laboratories in Butterworth Hospital there. With his concert tours leading him all over the globe, for a few months of each year, the guitarist has an opportunity to be part of a family.

The school arranges an on-campus apartment so he can get to classes easily. The college also smooths the way with immigration authorities, supplying the necessary papers to prove he is a distinguished alien.

Last Christmas, his mother came from Argentina for the occasion. Two young nieces and a 4-year-old nephew added enthusiasm to the family celebration.

Fierens, 33, is unmarried. According to one of his students, the handsome and prosperous Argentinian has little time for romance. "Besides," she added, "he is married to his guitar and his music."

HE BEGAN HIS studies in the music conservatory in his hometown, Lomas de Zamora, and gave his first public recital at 16. He spent one year at the Conservatory Manuel de Falla in Buenos Aires before going to Spain where he spent two years with the legendary Segovia.

Fierens says his original plan was to spend one summer in Segovia's classes, then study law. But the realization came: He wanted to play guitar, and he could not do both.

He made his debut in Spain in 1963. His continuing association with Segovia brought him to the United States where he made his American debut in 1965 in San Francisco.

He was awarded first prize at the Caracas International Guitar Competition in 1967. That was followed by a 30-concert tour of Mexico.

His career was interrupted when he

had to go home for an obligatory two-year stint in the Argentina Navy.

Military service completed, he toured France, Belgium and Scandinavia and has returned each year.

In 1971 he earned two first place awards—in the Citta D'Alessandria Competition in Italy, and Rio de Janeiro's Villa-Lobos.

FIERENS HAS appeared with orchestras throughout South America—the national orchestra of Brazil, Argentina and Costa Rica.

Music critics in local newspapers have responded to his talent. The *Miami Herald* said: "The audience gave Fierens enthusiastic applause

and standing ovation." The *San Francisco Chronicle* said: "Prodigious technique and an excellent command of the 300-year span of literature for the guitar."

The Feb. 27 concert in Plymouth Salem High School auditorium, Joy Road at Canton Center, will begin at 4 p.m. Tickets are available at the door or before the concert at Beitners Jewelry on Ann Arbor Trail, Plymouth Book World in Forest Place Mall, Audette's Office Supply on Ann Arbor Road at Sheldon, and Heide's Flowers, Harvey at Ann Arbor Trail.

Students kindergarten through grade 12 will be admitted free. Tickets for adults are \$3.50 with senior citizens admitted for half price. A Girl Scout troop will provide baby-sitting service at the school for children three years old and older.

The Plymouth Symphony League will serve coffee in the lobby during intermission. After the concert, the league will have a bake sale.

Members of the Plymouth Symphony Society will be admitted with their season tickets.

The concert is funded, in part, by a grant from the Michigan State Council of the Arts.

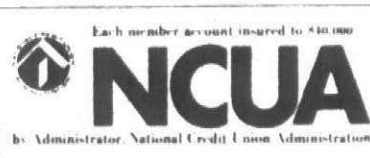

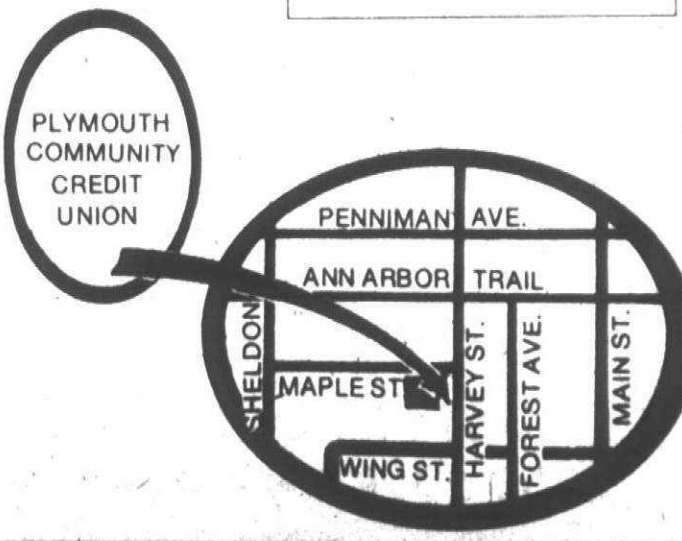

## Township gets more money

Over the next three years Plymouth Township will receive an additional \$150,000 in state revenue sharing funds because of an increase in population.

A recently released mid-decade census indicates that the township's current population is 20,450. In 1970, the year of the last census, the population was 17,488.

According to Clerk Helen Richardson, the 17 per cent increase will enable the township to qualify for about \$50,000 a year extra in revenue sharing money. She expects the first check sometime this year, with another one in 1978, and one more in 1979.

In addition to the money, the increased population has made the township eligible for two more liquor licenses.

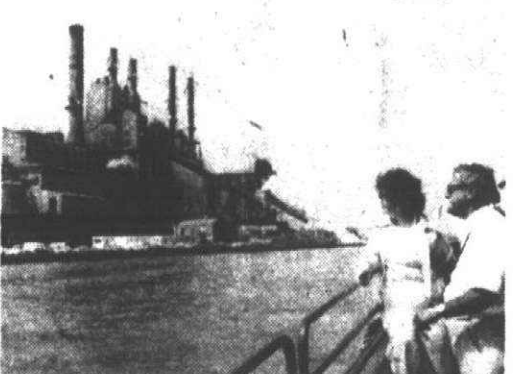

Lansing to ask the legislator to request a ruling from the attorney general on the ZBA controversy.

Bill Kandler, aide for Sen. Faust, said a letter from Donahue and Greenstein arrived Feb. 4 and the senator forwarded a request for a ruling on the matter to Kelley's office early last week.

"Donahue was an appointed public official and any time someone asks us to contact Kelley for a legal opinion we usually pass it on," Kandler said. "Even though, I guess, technically, now he's not a public official. When there's a legitimate area of legal uncertainty, we send it to Kelley's office."

"THERE ARE TWO questions we want Kelley to consider," Greenstein said. "Number one, whether the board was legally appointed. And, number two, whether Stein's amendment to change the ordinance to comply with state statute requires review by the planning commission and a public hearing. If not, he's in trouble there and that new board is illegally appointed."

# Readers' forum Cameraman's wife defends TV

Editor:

This is in response to the article in the Feb. 10 issue of the Observer-Eclectic, "Why we groan." The subject was a news conference about public transportation, with SEMTA General Manager Larry Salci and Chairman Tom Turner speaking.

You stated "Channel 7's entertainer waltzed in midway through the session."

"Entertainer?" Yes, television news people will be the first to admit there is a degree of entertainment involved in news reporting. After all, viewers want to be entertained. The Nielsen ratings are watched fervently by television executives. As the wife of a TV news cameraman, I have heard all of this from television people themselves.

AS A REPORTER yourself, you must be aware that there are times when a reporter must rush from one

story to another with barely time in between to think.

A day in the life of a reporter is often extremely hectic. Are you aware of the travel time, hurrying and complicated coordination efforts involved in reporting one day's news in the large Detroit metropolitan area for television?

The reporter you blasted may have rushed to the meeting from another story. If the TV news department had thought of it as trivial matter, they wouldn't have bothered to send anyone.

I quote you again, "... television entertainers who purport to be newspaperpersons." Really now, Mr. Newspaperman, I should think it beneath you to attack another reporter in such a personally derogatory manner.

Do I detect just a touch of professional jealousy toward television reporters? Do you really believe they

"waltz" and "chirp" through their stories? They may do that when they're on the air but not when they're on the road; dirty, exhausted and often hungry.

CONSTRUCTIVE CRITICISM is good; it helps in maintaining one's balance. But be fair. Your main point is that it was discourteous of the reporter to intrude upon the proceedings and ask for an on-the-spot synopsis of what had already been said. That's understandable, this all too well and theirs is a highly-competitive business. So, the next time you feel a sneer or groan coming on, put this in your reporter's notebook—TV reporters don't make a daily practice of arriving late and unprepared at news conferences. A good reporter's goal is to get in there, get the story and report it. Sometimes at the cost of personal humiliation.

"Our aim is to promote and aid business in the community, but also to work with residents, and local government too. We're continuing the Consumer Relations Bureau as one of our functions for people who might be having trouble with a business. I think we'll expand our research and information function so we have information available to people who are considering starting business or industry in Canton."

Also selected as a chamber officer is Bart Berg, first vice-president; Frank McMurray, second vice-president; Bill Brown, treasurer, and Al Daly, secretary.

AT WEDNESDAY'S meeting of the Canton Chamber at the Roman Forum, the results of the election to fill six vacant seats on the chambers board of directors were revealed.

John Schwartz, owner of Schwartz's Greenhouse, was picked for a three-year term on the board of directors, the same term Lillian Hopkins of the Super Bowl won. Bob Purdy, manager of the National Bank of Detroit's Canton office, will fill in the one remaining year of Phil Dingeldey's term of office which opened up when he moved away.

Schwartz, Hopkins and Purdy are serving their first terms of office.

Re-elected to three-year posts on the board of directors were Arnie Williams, owner of Arnold's Williams Music; Harold Fischer, of Harold Fischer Real Estate; and Frank McMurray of McMurray's State Farm Agency.

Lillian Hopkins, one of the three new members on the chamber board, said she will work to provide "a balance between population and business."

"This talk of growth control is frightening," Hopkins said. "Many businesses came to Canton four years ago during the land boom, due to ex-supervisor Phil Dingeldey's projected growth figures and his pro-business attitude."

"Now, different population figures are being bandied about, and this has caused some potential businesses to take a 'wait and see' posture."

RE-ELECTED chamber member Frank McMurray said he thinks the local business association should assist the public and the local government "with their business orientation and expertise."

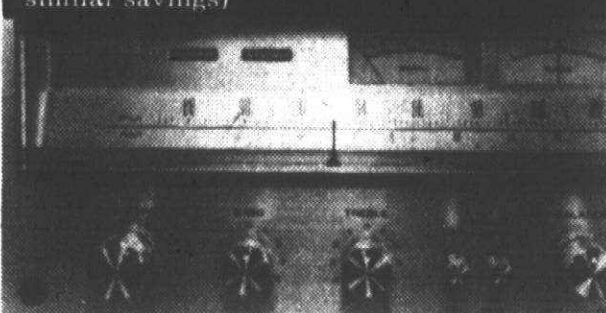

## But Churchill wins; race over

# Chiefs beat lowly Mott

Plymouth Canton cagers did what they had to do Friday night to keep hopes alive for a conference title. But they needed assistance—something Farmington Harrison didn't supply.

The Chiefs played solid basketball for the final quarter-and-a-half to defeat Waterford Mott 69-56 at the Plymouth gym. The victory gave Canton a 5-3 record in the Western Six League race.

Farmington Harrison hosted league-leading Livonia Churchill Friday—the other half of the equation if the Chiefs were going to make a late season run for the money.

The Hawks had to beat Churchill to regain a tie for the league title with a 6-2 record. A Hawk win would have set up a possible three-way tie for the conference crown with Harrison meeting Canton and Churchill traveling to Walled Lake Western next Friday.

But all hopes for Canton's share of the league title evaporated when Churchill stopped Harrison 59-50 to wrap up the crown outright on the basis of a 7-1 record.

So the Chiefs will do battle at Harrison next Friday for runner-up honors.

Both teams enter the tilt with identical 5-3 records.

CANTON'S OVERALL RECORD stands at 9-8 on the season. Considering the Chiefs' lowly 1-5 mark at the holiday break, their 1977 performance leaves little room for complaint.

What seems even more amazing is that Canton still was in the running in the league race until Friday, despite finishing the first half of the conference campaign with a 2-3 mark, three games off the pace set by Churchill.

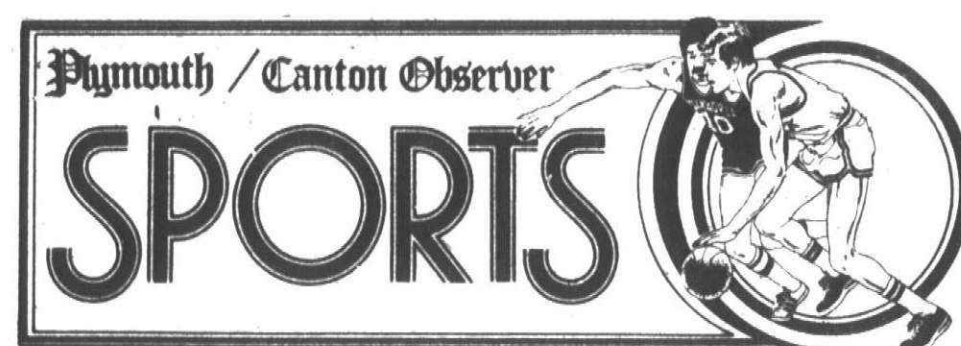
The Chiefs have won all three of their league games in the second half of the season. The contest against Walled Lake Western was cancelled because of a bad snow earlier last month.

Now, one can only look back to the first half the year when the Chiefs lost to Western by a mere three points and blew a five-point lead in the waning moments against Churchill.

Given those two games in the win column for Canton, it might well have been the Chiefs looking down at everyone in the loop, instead of Churchill.

CANTON DIDN'T play with the intensity or desire in the first 20 minutes of the game against Mott. But when it came time to put things away, the Chiefs looked formidable.

Canton held a slim 35-32 lead at the intermission and that margin

dwindled to one, 42-41, at the three-minute mark of the third period. But after a timeout, the Chiefs went into overdrive, waking up with nine straight points to close out the quarter with a 51-41 lead.

Canton spurred to a 17 point lead at the five-minute mark of the final period. Then coach Casey Cavell began substituting the rest of his 13-man squad with the game secure.

Canton's biggest margin in the game was 20 points, 69-49. Mott scored the final seven points of the game with the reserves in.

"We weren't moving on defense in the first half," Cavell said. "It took us a while to do it (win), but I don't care as long as it's done."

"We have a tendency to play like the other team. If a team is bad, we

play bad. If the team is good, we play good."

"We could have beat Mott by 25 points and we should have done it earlier. But if I hadn't used the rest of the team we probably would have won by 25."

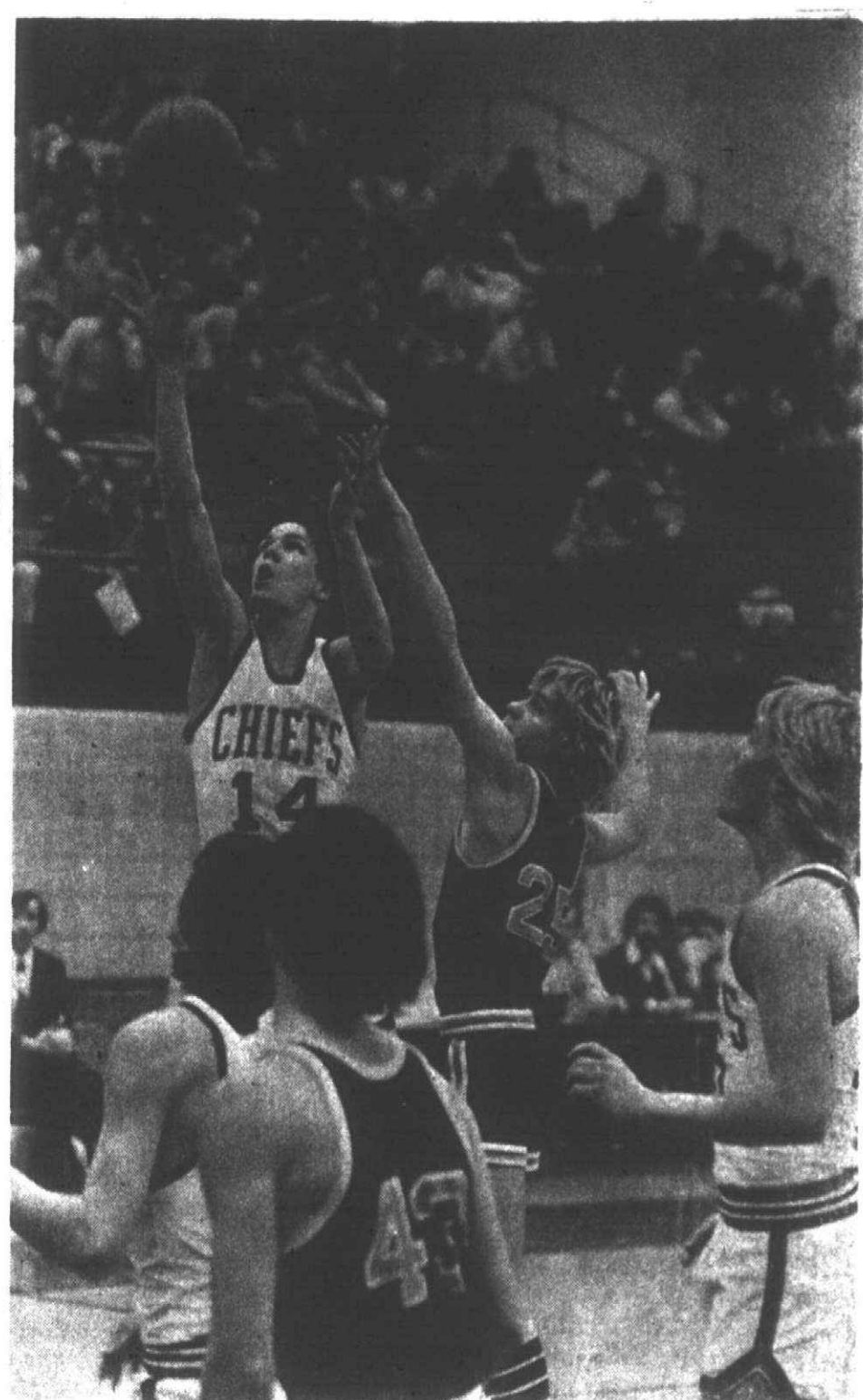

## Rocks blown out of gym; Belleville roars, 85-55

From Plymouth Salem's viewpoint it's a pity the Rocks couldn't have packed up and left the Belleville gym after the first quarter of their basketball game there Friday night, for at that stage of the evening they led, 21-20.

But the rules still say there are four quarters to every contest and when the Rocks finally did escape they were in a state of shock on the short end of an 85-55 score—marking the first time since 1973 that they have

lost two games in a row.

Sure, the Rocks are Suburban Eight champs for the fourth straight year, but it would be hard to convince any Belleville fan that they deserve the title. In every one of those championship seasons the Tigers have smacked Plymouth to the mat, this latest defeat being the most embarrassing the Rocks have suffered in years.

"WE DIDN'T control the game tempo," admitted Salem coach Fred Thomann whose Rocks scored only six points in the third quarter and 11 in the fourth for a second half total of

17 compared to Belleville's 44.

"We attacked their man-to-man defense well in the first period, but from then on we let them intimidate us," added Thomann who now faces the task of restyling the Salem offense on the eve of the state tournament, which starts next week. In two remaining league games Salem will be at Edsel Ford Tuesday night and will close out the regular schedule at home Friday against Allen Park.

The Rocks are 14-3 overall and have a 10-1 league record. Still locked in a three-corner battle for second place in

the Sub 8 are Belleville (8-4), Livonia Bentley (7-4) and Dearborn (7-4). Belleville will play at Bentley Tuesday, and then will host Dearborn Friday.

SENIOR BRUCE GERISH, having the best scoring night of his career, got nine of his eventual 15 points in the first period as Salem fought the Tigers nose to nose.

Then Chris DeBear, who was to wind up with 13 as the only other Rock in double figures, sparked second quarter action with seven, and at the half it still was a tight ball game with Belleville on top, 41-38.

After that the Tigers adopted the Rocks as their choice pets of the winter, capitalizing on 12 steals and a 41-24 edge in rebounds to run off and hide, guided on their way by the enthu-

siastic shouts of a hometown Belleville mob.

Kelvin Patterson, key man in one fast break after another, was high scorer for the Tigers with 28 points, followed by Kevin Barnes with 14 and Cornell Grantham with 12. With 39 field goals in 78 tries Belleville shot exactly 50 per cent from the floor, while Plymouth was hitting at a 39 per cent pace on 22 of 57.

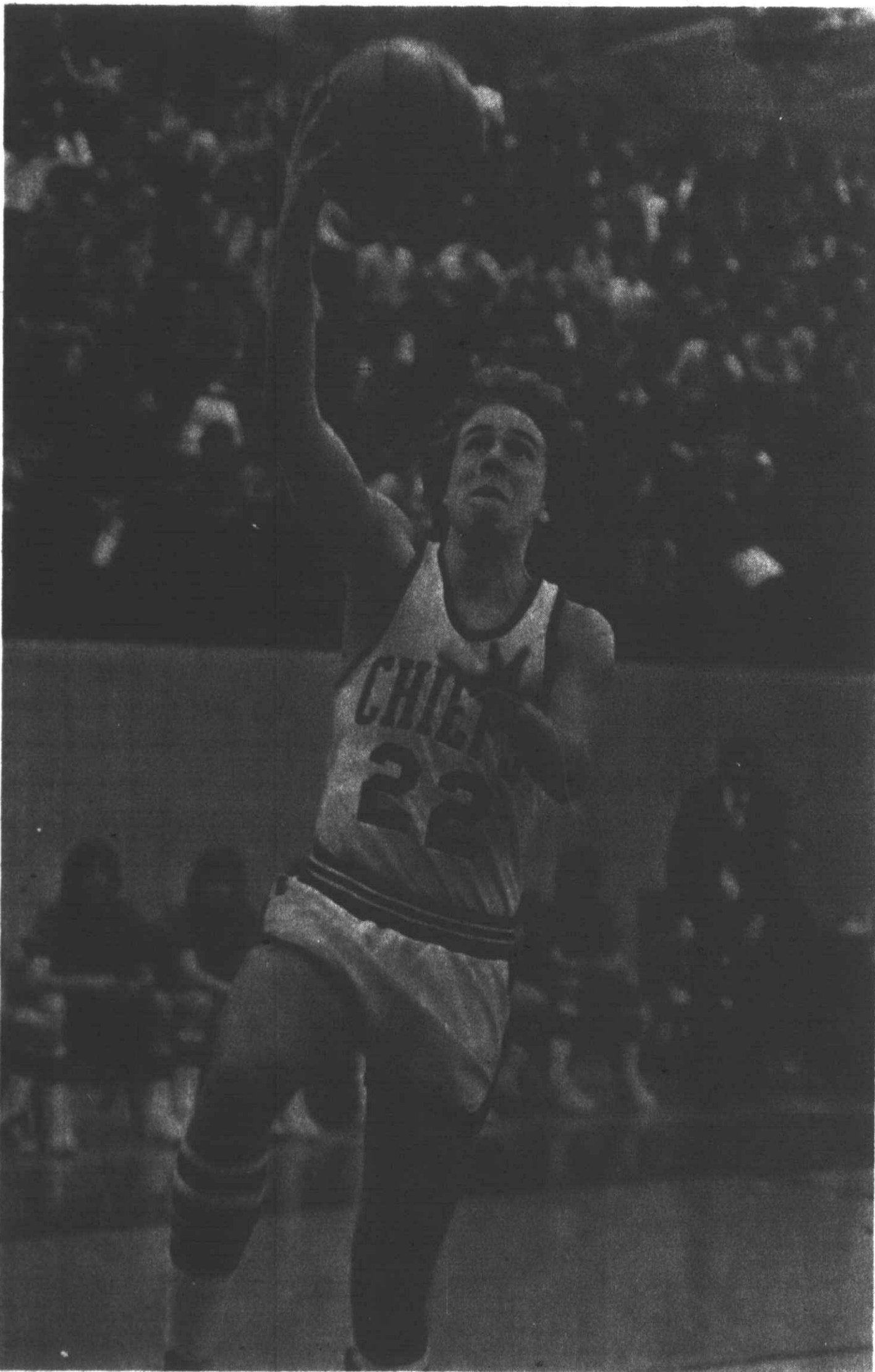
The Plymouth Canton junior varsity basketball team won going away against Waterford Mott 74-60 Friday night.

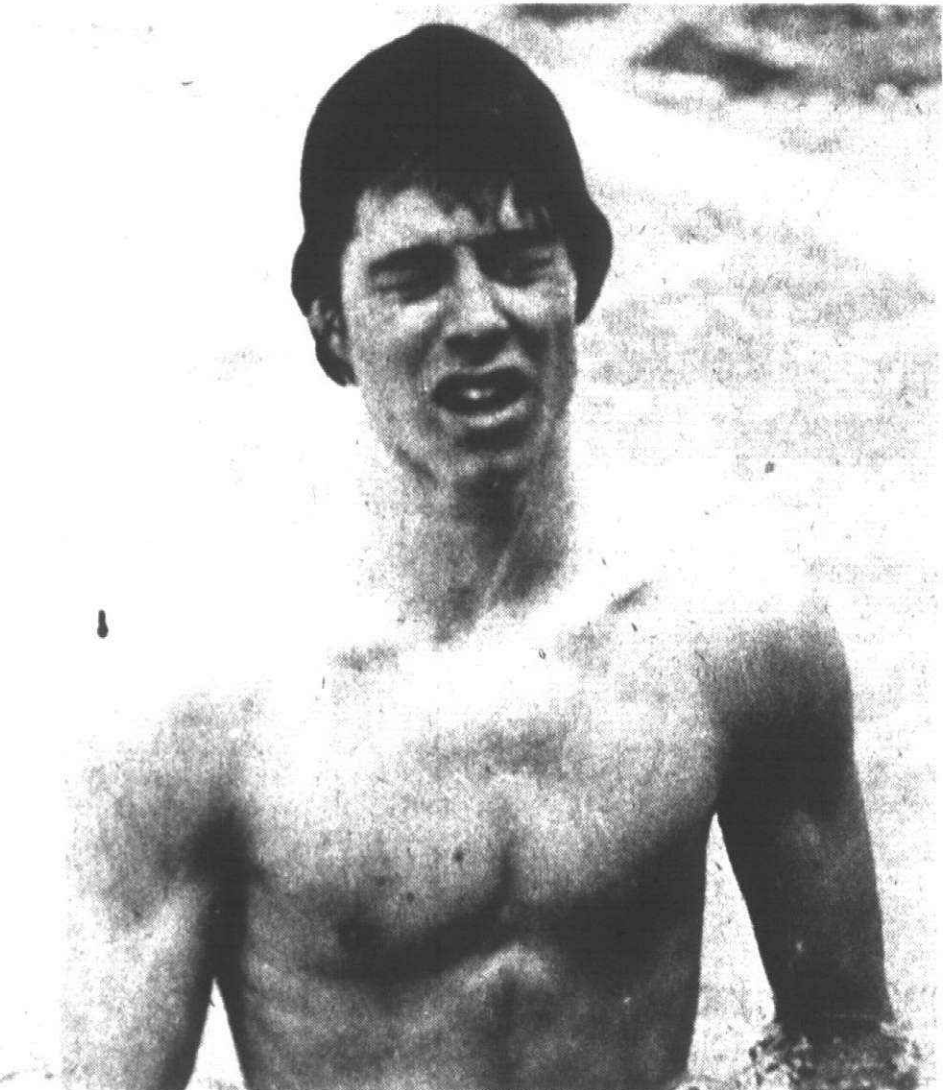
The Rocks also have a decent chance of placing in the top 15 in the state, but could finish in the second division of their conference race.

## Geriatric service makes house calls

Believe it or not there are still a few medical people around who make house calls.

The Geriatric Screening and Outpatient Service based in Northville State Hospital and at 16401 Grand River, Detroit, will send one of its representatives into a home to help a family determine what should be done with the person aged 60 or older who needs some kind of care.

Should he be sent to Northville? Could a nursing home better serve his needs? Or is it possible that with a few supportive services he could stay at home?

The area covered by the service includes the city of Detroit west of Woodward, and the cities of Plymouth, Livonia, Redford Township and Northville.

It is partially funded through a service contract with the Detroit-Wayne County Mental Health Services and supplemented by the services and support of Northville State Hospital.

"Part of our philosophy is to keep senior citizens as independent as possible," explained Alan Mazur, director of the service. "If we can do this, it will save the time of the hospital staff."

HE HAS FOUND it a real advantage to see the individual in his natural environment.

"You get a better picture of the overall level of his functioning,"

Mazur said. You can notice how efficient he is in caring for his daily needs.

"You can see how well his place is kept up. Is there food in the refrigerator? Is he paying his bills? You couldn't pick up all this in a clinical setting when the person came in."

GERIATRIC SCREENING and Outpatient Service started about six years ago when Northville Hospital phased out its geriatric unit because of financial problems. The hospital continued to admit elderly persons with psychiatric problems, but not those who were senile.

"In 1974 when the mental health statute was rewritten, it said that the state hospital was not a nursing home," noted Mazur. "So, since 1974 a number of former psychiatric patients have been discharged into the community because the hospital was only giving them domiciliary care."

Now residing in nursing homes, they are given, when needed, outpatient service at their place of residence. This is in line with the primary objective of the service to offer evaluation, outpatient therapy and consultation to minimize the psychiatric hospitalization of the elderly.

Let's see what happens when a call comes to Mazur about an elderly resident of nursing home.

"An 85-year-old lady was striking out at people at her nursing home, and they felt she was unmanageable,"

said Mazur. "They didn't know how to handle her."

"We went down to see the lady to try to determine if she had a psychiatric problem. We studied to see if anything in her environment was causing her to strike out at staff members and other people."

"Or maybe the medication was increased, and had an agitating effect on her."

"If the situation is such that we think the environment was involved in her aggression, we make suggestions to the nursing home staff on how to work with the lady. If that doesn't work, we can suggest a transfer to another facility."

MAZUR SAID that if the home was willing to work with the woman, he would see her six to eight times in the coming month to try to work with her and the staff. After the first month, he would see her once a month before the termination of visits.

The visits he makes can sometimes have an unexpected consequence.

He described one case in which he advised an elderly woman to leave the nursing home where she was living and take an apartment by herself.

Another resident, a man recovering from a stroke and worried what would happen to him because he had no relatives, noted the woman's departure and asked Mazur why he made her leave.

"We said we didn't make her

leave," Mazur related, "and asked her to write him a letter explaining this."

After that letter was written, the man began to think of being on his own but still was worried. Mazur assured him there were volunteers who would visit him.

"So we put him in the position to tell us who to contact about getting an apartment," Mazur said. "We wanted to show him he'd have to follow through by himself, just as if he were in his own home."

"He decided to live on his own. He moved into an apartment with another fellow. They have an application pending for senior citizen housing. He's financially stable, less depressed and more independent than he was in a nursing home."

"IT COSTS in the area of \$50 a day to keep a person in Northville," said Mazur. "In a nursing home it's about \$20-25 a day. That's two to two-and-a-half times cheaper."

He explained that the service is "trying to assure that everyone gets the type of care that he requires."

He added: "It's frustrating to the hospital staff to have to hospitalize someone who is senile and doesn't require psychiatric treatment. That person is taking a bed away from a person who could profit from psychiatric care."

In this sense, the outpatient service can be viewed as an alternative to

inpatient treatment. Individual and group therapy are offered along with counseling directed at specific problem areas.

# 'Mustache look undesirable—for houses'

"Try to avoid giving your house a mustache this spring," said landscape planner Jim Joy.

He offered this advice to members of the Plymouth branch American Association of University Women at their gardening mini-session program.

The mustache is a common landscaping trap that befalls homeowners. In this design, plantings are lined up side-by-side directly in front of the house, creating a restricted, unnatural effect.

Joy, a representative of Christensen's Nursery, suggests the only ones to benefit from this plan are your neighbors across the street.

"The homeowner invests a great deal of money in shrubbery and flowers that he can't see from the house. Conversely, you are at the mercy of your neighbors' gardening tastes which will be the view from your window."

IN ANOTHER of the mini-sessions, William Saxton of Saxton Gardening Supplies in Plymouth discussed the variety of grass blends used in this area.

When seeding a lawn, he recommends a blend of grasses offering differing qualities.

Manhattan rye, for example, is a hearty, fast-growing grass.

Nugget, a recent development, is noted for its disease resistance. The

blue grasses offer the lush dense green everyone desires. Combine these three with Fyking, Baron or Delta seed and you have the ingredients for a lawn your neighbors will envy.

Saxton also warned the group about watering needs.

A new lawn requires watering four or five times a day. One that is established needs an inch per week, and more during the hot dry summer months.

"Don't put the sprinkler out late in the evening. Grass that remains wet at night will be easy prey for disease."

"Mulch a seed landscape with straw or wood bark," he suggested. "It can be used later as a border fill or in a compost. When the grass is tall enough to mow, rake away the mulch. Don't forget the fertilizer. Most lawns require an average of five feedings between spring and fall. Some need as many as 10 applications."

BETTY PORTER discussed 18th century flower arranging in another mini-session.

The kinds of floral displays used in this period were shown including a demonstration of composition. Flower gathering and drying tips were suggested to start the ladies on their own creations.

Other topics discussed during the evening were flower and vegetable gardening, led by Gerald Draheim of the Wayne County Extension Service, and House Plant How To, by AAUW member Suzie Coker.

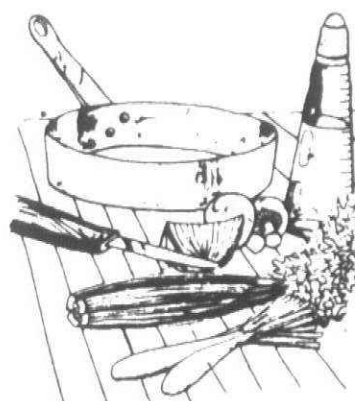

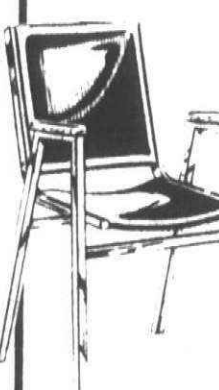

## The Stroller Norris boomerang

Sitting on the sidelines these days reading about the maneuvering between Detroit city officials and the Norris family over the future of the Detroit Red Wing hockey team and Olympia. The Stroller can't help chuckling and sending out a warning "Don't sell Norris short." And he can speak from experience.

As he follows the word battle in the public prints, The Stroller recalls his one and only confrontation with the Norris clan and how his actions boomeranged.

The confrontation came in the days when Detroit was one of the centers of amateur boxing and The Stroller was sport editor of the Free Press.

AT THE TIME, Joe Louis, then just a youngster out of Brewster Center who had taken a job as a laborer at Ford's, was starting his climb up the pugilistic ladder and acquired quite a following. The Free Press had taken over the Golden Gloves franchise for the area and it proved to be a very successful promotion as the amateurs filled the big building on Grand River to capacity.

But at the height of the activity, many of the people rebelled.

They started asking, "Does the paper need money that bad that they have to depend on the spilling of young people's blood?"

Called up to the office of the paper's top officials, The Stroller was asked what could be done to quiet the critics, and still sponsor The Golden Gloves.

"Why not make it a charity event," The Stroller suggested, "and we can turn the receipts over to the Free Press Fresh Air Camp that is run for the benefit of all the children."

The idea was accepted. Then, with visions of a sizeable fund each year, The Stroller journeyed out to Olympia for a meeting with the late James Norris, father of the present owner, to attempt a new deal.

At the time, Olympia demanded 15 per cent of the gross receipts for rental of the arena for a single night, and that was a lot of money, especially when the stadium was sold out.

With great hospitality, he was ushered into Norris's office and asked to make himself comfortable. He had spoken to Norris quite casually at times, but never to discuss business.

Now he was face to face with the man who had earned the reputation as the Grain King of the country and a very astute business man.

"Mr. Norris," he began, "we have decided to make the Golden Gloves Tournament a charity event. We are going to turn the money over to the Fresh Air Camp and help thousands of kids in the city."

"And I came to ask if you would join in the spirit of the thing and reduce the rent."

He just looked across the desk and calmly said, "We don't get anything for nothing in your paper. We pay for everything we get. So why not keep our relations on a good business basis."

Let each of us pay our own way."

From the tone of his voice, The Stroller was convinced that there was no sense in entering into a debate.

"If that is your decision," The Stroller said, "I'll sign the contract again." It was signed for the usual 15 per cent.

Then, turning to Norris, The Stroller said, "If you think you never have received anything for nothing in our paper, let me tell you that, starting today, we will have no hockey writer."

"There will be daily publicity stories and we will just confirm the rumor that you are going to play on the day of the game. And we will print the score after the game. That's all."

He just smiled and countered, "If that's the value you put on my team that's your business. You do as you want."

AND THAT'S what happened. There were no advance notices of the hockey games and the barest of coverage when the game was over.

Then what do you suppose happened?

The Red Wings won the Stanley Cup, the world's championship of hockey. We had to send a crew of photographers and feature writers to the games.

And Norris just sat in his private box and laughed.

So don't sell the Norris clan short in the present maneuvering over the Red Wings and the future of Olympia.
