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Land use group called pro-growth

One angry member of the Canton Land Use Study Committee believes that committee's intention to explore ways of preserving farm land is fast becoming a farce.

Because of "an overwhelming pro-development stance" of the majority of committee members and its chairman, Bart Berg, she feels the study group has lost its founding ideal.

On several occasions, Linda LaBelle, a Canton newcomer living in Sunflower subdivision, has registered numerous protests about the direction of the research being done by the land use committee. Tuesday night was no exception.

Mrs. LaBelle said the land use committee's chairman, Bart Berg, has attempted to "spoonfeed" slanted or reactionary information to the people on the study group.

Two weeks ago Mrs. LaBelle exhibited a Xeroxed copy of an article entitled "Land Grab," published in the

January 1977 issue of the John Birch Society's magazine, American Opinion which was distributed to committee members. She called the article an attempt to "brainwash" committee members into opposing zoning and planning controls by branding them Socialist ideas.

THE AMERICAN OPINION article decries zoning regulations as an affront to an individual's right to "use his land as he sees fit, so long as he does no damage to the right and property of others."

Mrs. LaBelle announced at a recent public forum that Berg handed her a copy of the "Land Grab" article. Because of the right-wing nature of the article, Mrs. LaBelle said, she objected strongly to it and "couldn't believe they thought we'd swallow this type of propaganda without a protest."

Berg, the committee's chairman,

said one of the committee members brought in the article "as one view regarding land use, not the view we wish to implement or promote."

Berg said he doesn't endorse the views of the article or the John Birch Society but felt that committee members could digest the literature without any harm done.

"I can't fathom the motives behind that woman's wild accusations," Berg said at the time.

During a land use study meeting last month Mrs. LaBelle suggested that former Supervisor Robert Greenstein be invited to speak to committee members on the 1976 Master Land Use Plan that Supervisor Stein now wants to discard.

SINCE GREENSTEIN was one of the architects of the plan which calls for urbanization on the east half of Canton and agricultural land on the west, Mrs. LaBelle said Greenstein was an obvious source.

"The members of the land use committee took a vote to decide if Greenstein should speak," Mrs. LaBelle said. "It was the first time a vote was taken to decide if a speaker would be invited or not. Well, people said he was too political and voted him down."

"They're the ones who are being political," Mrs. LaBelle said. "What are they afraid of? That they might learn something from the man? I'm sure they'll claim I'm just a Greenstein supporter. Can't they see this goes beyond politics? I'm concerned about future development in Canton and the fact that only one side is being represented—the side that wants to sell their land to developers."

Asked why Greenstein wasn't invited to speak to the study group, Berg said recently that the vast majority of the committee is familiar with the 1976 Master Plan pushed by Greenstein.

"**SHE MOVED** into the township

last year and we're supposed to go back and study all this just so she can catch up," Berg said. "The people on this committee just don't have time to teach her everything we've already been through. If she wants to study the 1976 plan or discuss it with Greenstein on her own time, I say fine. But we're trying to come up with new approaches and new recommendations."

Berg has a farming background and is owner of Bart's Nursery, 48630 Michigan Ave. He opposed Greenstein and the 1976 Master Plan because he said farmers who were forbidden to sell their land to developers were not provided with "just compensation."

At Tuesday night's board meeting, Trustee Lynne Goldsmith said Mrs. LaBelle may alienate some people with an accusatory approach "but all is not rosy on that land use committee. We may see a minority report and a majority report."

Families pick school options

One Canton mother praises Miller Elementary School's existing year-round calendar as a program that has increased her child's interest in school and brought her family closer together throughout the entire year.

Not sharing her neighbor's views, another mother pulled her son out of Miller's 45-15 program at the end of one school year. She criticizes the Extended School Year (ESY) program as a disruptive force in her family's life that interfered with vacations and summer trips to the beach.

HUNDREDS OF FAMILIES in the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools must soon weigh the pros and cons of the 45-15 program and decide whether their children will attend school on the year-round calendar or on the traditional September-to-June schedule.

School board members last week "designated" an expansion of Miller's 45-15 or ESY program into four elementary schools—Field, Eriksson, Hulsing and Isbister—and Pioneer Middle School.

Under the 45-15 program, four groups or "tracks" of students attend school for nine weeks and receive three-week vacations spaced throughout the year. The schedule increases the capacity of school buildings by one-third.

If it goes according to plans, parents of children enrolled at schools earmarked for ESY will be asked to pick either 45-15 or the traditional calendar year by April 15, says School Supt. John M. Hoben. School officials hope to assign tracks to 45-15 children, according to neighborhoods, by May 15.

Parents opting out of the ESY program will have to transport their children to schools paired with the 45-15 buildings. Bus service will not be provided.

The paired school for Field is Fiegl; for Eriksson, Allen; for Miller, Gallimore; for Hulsing, Tanger; for Isbister, Starkweather; and for Pioneer, East Middle School.

Hoben warns parents who opt out of the 45-15 program that ESY could be expanded into still more schools next year, including schools paired with

buildings this year designated for the ESY program.

"We can only guarantee the option (to go to paired schools) this year," the superintendent said. "I think 45-15 is a distinct possibility for other schools next year. We just can't handle the growth in Canton and Plymouth townships under the present system."

IN EFFORTS to guide parents faced with a choice between 45-15 and the traditional calendar year, the Observer contacted parents of children enrolled in Miller's pilot 45-15 program as well as parents in Miller's attendance area who sent their children to Gallimore and its traditional school calendar.

Unlike parents who opted out of 45-15, parents with children at Miller voiced little criticism of the year-round program. Much of the apprehension they felt, when the program was first implemented in July, 1975, has vanished, and many of the problems caused by the year-round schedule have been solved.

"I was very hesitant when 45-15 was first proposed," said Mrs. Bebe Fairchild, whose first and third graders are enrolled at Miller. "I was concerned there would be a lot of lesson repeating after each break, and I had no idea how much it would disrupt our schedule."

"But now my attitude has completely changed. I can tell my son is better suited to year-round school. He gets bored easily with the same routine, and I think the breaks are good for him. He looks forward to the break after nine weeks, and he looks forward to going back to school after the break."

A first-year evaluation report, submitted by Miller's administration on 45-15, supports Mrs. Fairchild's position that frequent three-week breaks have a positive effect on pupils' learning abilities.

Eighty-nine percent of Miller's teaching staff thought the breaks had a positive effect on students' learning abilities, and 92 per cent of the teachers said the frequent breaks decrease pupils' boredom with school.

Folker's Nursery lease is extended

The Canton Township Board will extend the Folker's Nursery lease an extra year until Aug. 1, 1978 to allow the company to sell remaining trees and shrubs and permit the township to start building the new administration building on property it doesn't officially own yet.

As of March 1, 1976, Canton still owed \$179,000 on the 65-acre nursery site. Under terms of the extended lease, the nursery personnel will be allowed to sell remaining greenery and stay in the house which sits on the property, until August 1978. After that, the entire parcel will be in Canton's hands and any remaining greenery will be the property of Canton Township.

Groundbreaking on the nursery site must begin before April 20, 1976 under terms of the federal Economic Development Administration which granted Canton \$2,715,000 last December.

All seven board members approved the lease extension during Tuesday's

roll call vote. But just after the meeting was adjourned, Trustee Robert Myers announced that he'd voted wrong on the item.

MYERS EXPLAINED that he wanted to change his vote because it is his consistent policy to oppose building a new administration building.

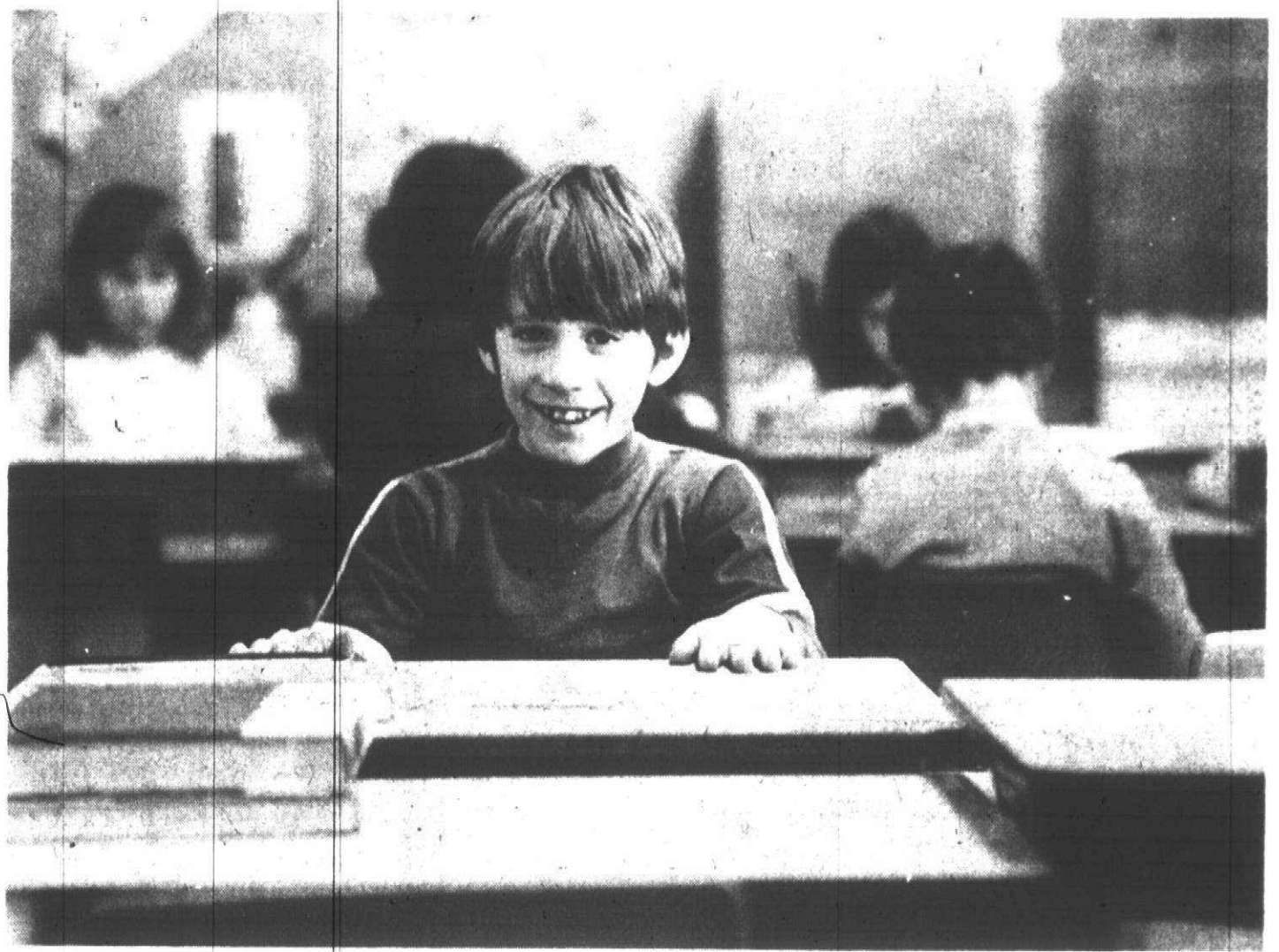
"I meant to vote no, I'd like to change my vote," Myers said.

At that point most of the board members had left the meeting hall and the trustee said in order to change his recorded vote the rest of the board would have to vote in favor of allowing him the privilege.

"I don't think they're about to do that," Myers said.

Myers has likened Canton's acceptance of the \$2.7 million federal grant to Mayor Coleman Young's desire to build a riverfront stadium with federal money.

"We can't afford the maintenance costs of a building of this size," Myers has said.

These Miller parents list their objections to 45-15

For a variety of reasons, nearly 12 per cent of the 1,076 elementary pupils who live in Miller school's attendance area have opted out of that school's year-round program.

Instead, 126 students attend Gallimore Elementary School on the traditional school calendar from September to June, according to Florence Beier of Plymouth-Canton Community School District.

Some of the students have working mothers who could not find babysitters to comply with Miller's 45-15 schedule, under which pupils attend school for nine weeks and get three weeks' off.

Others have brothers and sisters who attend high school or middle school on the traditional schedule. Parents of those children did not want to cope with two separate school schedules.

Some opted out of Miller's 45-15 program, because they did not want to give up the long summer break. Others attend Gallimore because of parental dislike of Miller's "open-school" architecture and teaching method.

Miller's pilot 45-15, or Extended School Year (ESY), program will be expanded to Pioneer Middle School and four other elementary schools in the Plymouth-Canton Community School District this July.

School officials hope 45-15's expansion into Pioneer Middle School will eliminate the gripes of some anti-ESY parents.

If the district's attendance boundary committee can alter Pioneer's attendance area so all five ESY elementary schools feed into the middle school, dual scheduling problems would be eliminated for families with elementary children on 45-15 and middle school children on the traditional calendar year.

Parents of children enrolled at schools designated for ESY will soon have to make a choice between 45-15 and the traditional calendar year.

BEVERLY LITTLETON, whose first grader last year attended Miller on the 45-15 schedule, took her son out of Miller last September and sent him to Gallimore.

There were many reasons, Mrs. Littleton recalled. The year-round program interfered with her family's vacation plans and traditional summer activities. But, worst of all, her son resisted going to bed at an early hour during the hot, summer months.

"The main thing was that the entire neighborhood wasn't on 45-15," she said. "During the summer, other kids would be outside playing and making noise. You can't expect the whole neighborhood to be quiet and comply, just because your child has to be in bed by 7:30 or 8."

The Canton mother said her family had to forego a vacation trip last summer because her child was in school when her husband had time off from work. Her husband, an employee at Ford Motor Co., puts in a great deal of overtime during the rest of the year, she said.

"Therefore, we had no special time together as a family, and I thought it was endangering our family life. We like to do things together in the summer, and it seemed we never had the time. We hardly ever used our pool membership at all, and Matt couldn't

understand why he had to go to school while other kids swam."

Mrs. Littleton said she does not regret the decision to transfer her son to Gallimore.

"He still looks forward to going to school everyday," she said, "and he's really looking forward to being out this summer. Taking him out of Miller was in the back of our minds all along. The summer deal was just the straw that broke the camel's back."

JUDY BRAKE'S FAMILY moved into Miller's attendance area after 45-15 was implemented.

Mrs. Brake left the decision between 45-15 and the traditional calendar year up to her third-grade son, Scott. The third grader opted for Gallimore.

"I think having three weeks off every once in awhile is not the same as a summer break," she said. "They need their summer. The big thing is that my children love to be outside in the summer."

Canton father Eric Harrington sent his two elementary children to Gallimore, because he and his wife are teachers on the traditional calendar year.

"While we're working, our kids would have been home alone," he said.

3 residents want EDC

Three Canton residents have formally submitted a written application asking Canton Township to establish an Economic Development Corporation to attract business with tax-free revenue bonds.

The citizen's application to the township is a technical formality that must be met, according to Supervisor Harold Stein, before any municipality can invite competing applicants to apply for permission to incorporate an economic incentive body for the municipality.

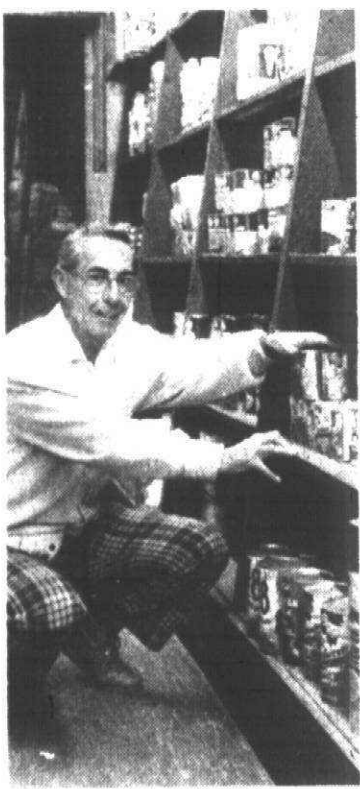
The municipality may encourage the establishment of an EDC and issues tax-exempt revenue bonds to participants, but is not liable for any debts such a corporation might incur.

The three names of EDC petitioners announced by Stein are Warren Atwood, Lou Stein, former Canton supervisor (no relation to Harold Stein), and Andy Smith Jr.

A public hearing is required before any EDC application is approved.

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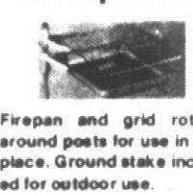
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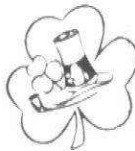
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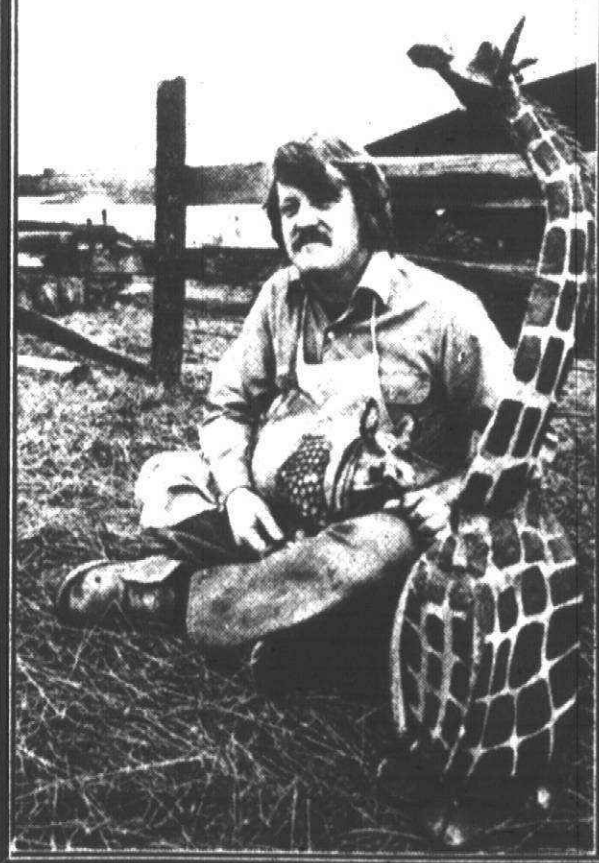
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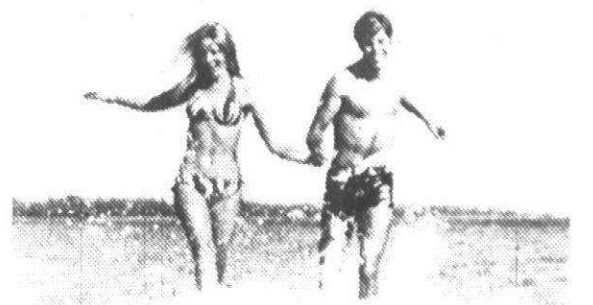
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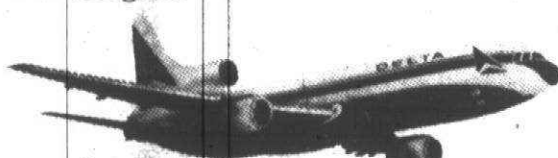
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County fights crime with bird's eye view

Ptl. Mike Geldmacher used to work in the narcotics division of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department. Now he's high almost every day.

No cause for alarm. Geldmacher, of Romulus, is one of four helicopter pilots employed in the aviation unit of the Wayne County Sheriff's Department on the grounds of Metro Airport.

The aviation unit was funded for by the county commissioners for \$80,000 from October 1976 to June 30, 1977 to cover operational expenses.

The helicopter patrols usually lend support to officers on the ground when a crime is in process. With the advantage of a bird's eye vantage point, the officer in the copter can keep an eye on a subject being pursued, or look for fleeing suspects.

BUT THE less glamorous side to the aviation unit are the crime prevention patrols and the public service duties such as checking the ice in Wilcox Lake for cracks.

"It's been a while since I independently spotted a criminal from the air and helped in apprehending him," Geldmacher said. "But the other day I found a couple of kids playing near the I-275 expressway. Turns out they were about four years old, much too young to be out there. We contacted their parents and avoided what could have been a bad situation."

Geldmacher has been with the Wayne County Sheriff's Department eight years, and the past four have been in the aviation unit.

"I worked in the Metro (narcotics) Squad for two, two-and-a-half years before the aviation unit opened up," Geldmacher said. "The duty was getting me pretty burned out. The aviation unit was just forming and I thought it'd be a good change, so I put in for a transfer and trained out here at Mettetal Airport."

TUESDAY WAS a slow day for aerial crime-stopping.

After warming up the helicopter and checking the gauges, Geldmacher veered south of Mettetal, over Pickwick Village subdivision.

The helicopter only seats two—including Geldmacher—so the Observer photographer and reporter had to take turns flying.

Canton and Plymouth Township's subdivisions were given a close in-

spection by the helicopter crew as part of a regular patrol.

Woods behind Eriksson Elementary on Haggerty Road are routinely checked by Geldmacher because a number of stolen cars have been stripped and abandoned in that location.

Likewise, an abandoned barn on Hanford, between Ridge and Napier, is given a close look because thieves have stripped cars inside the barn and left the shell.

Nothing unusual was happening at either site Tuesday.

From the air, the grounds of DeHoCo prison looked like quaint old cottages, surrounded by apple orchards. To the north, horses were limbering up at Northville Downs.

WITH THE temperatures unseasonably in the 50s, women were hanging clothes out to dry in yards near McClumpha.

The Plymouth-Canton community takes on a different perspective about 1,000 feet up in the air. The flat land

looks even flatter but the so-called "urban sprawl" isn't quite so evident when viewed on an overall perspective.

Construction crews were busy digging basements for new homes on the east and west sides of Sheldon, south of Joy. But an aerial view illustrates the fact that farmland still virtually surrounds Plymouth and Canton, from three sides.

There is not a clear dividing line in the juxtaposition of farms and residential areas in Canton and Plymouth townships.

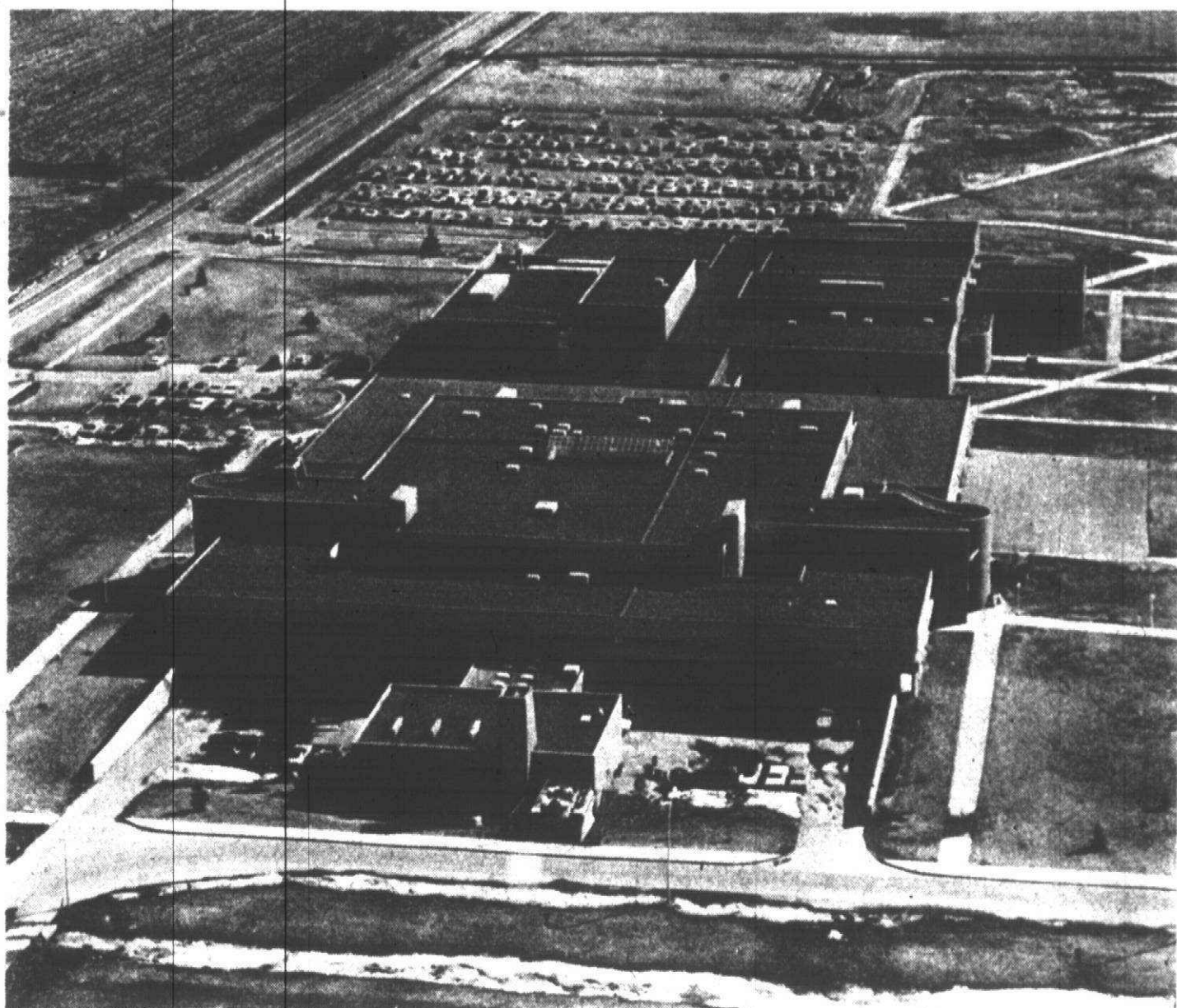
In Canton, it is not far from the clean cul-de-sacs of Windsor Park to three rustic farms on Saltz, east of Ridge, where junk cars, and discarded metal are strewn about.

There are drinking ponds for milk cows and horses on Plymouth Township farms contrasted against the abundance of backyard pools behind subdivision homes.

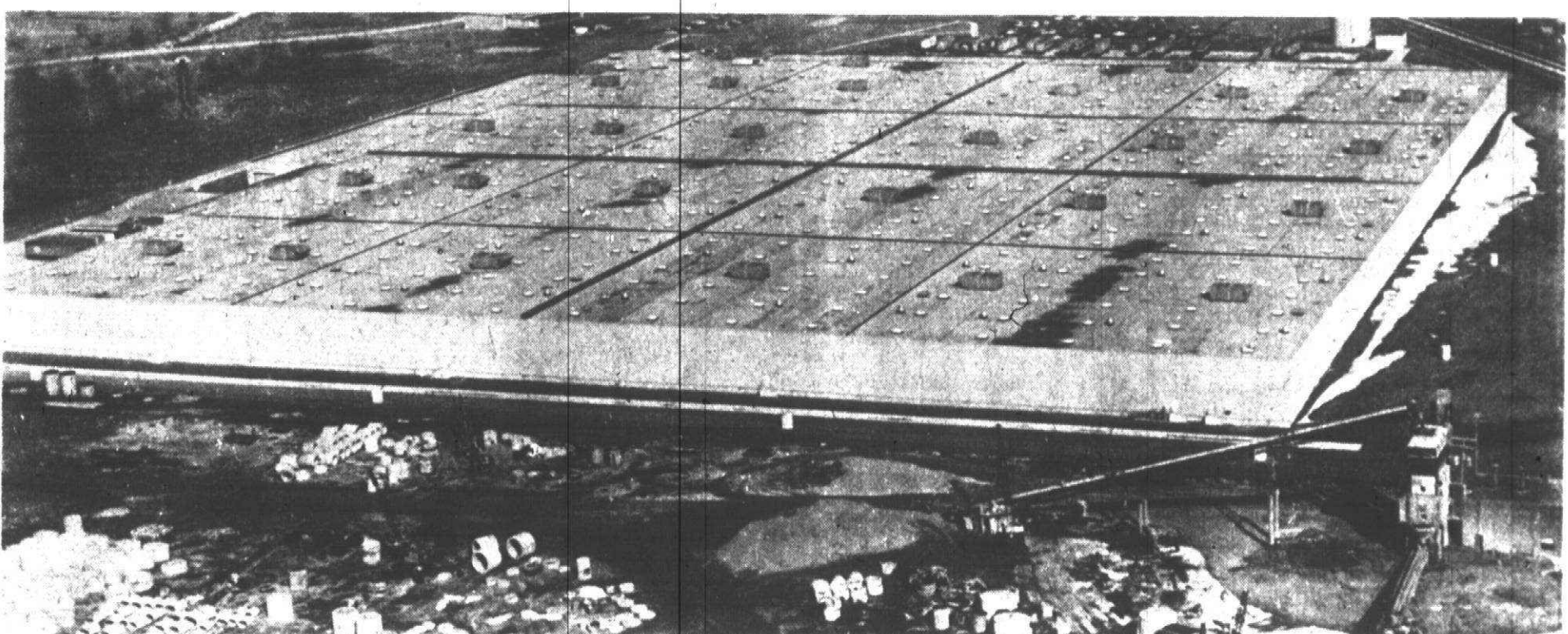
Heading back to the airport, Geldmacher looked for action along Hines Park and flew low over Newburgh Lake.

The difference in the temperature of the ice and the warm air caused the copter to buck back and forth.

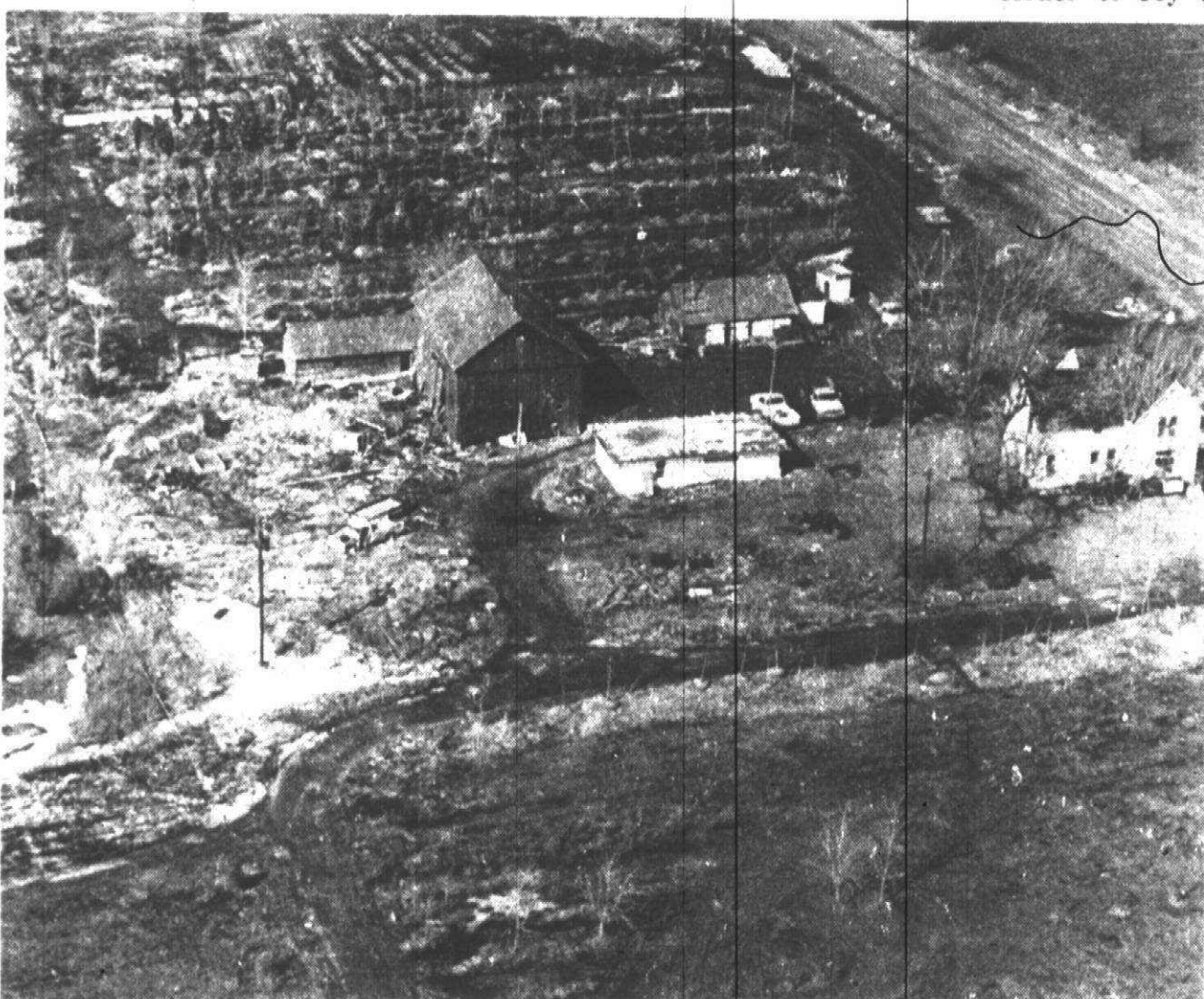
Back at Mettetal, Geldmacher shook the hand of the reporter with the green complexion and lifted off once more.



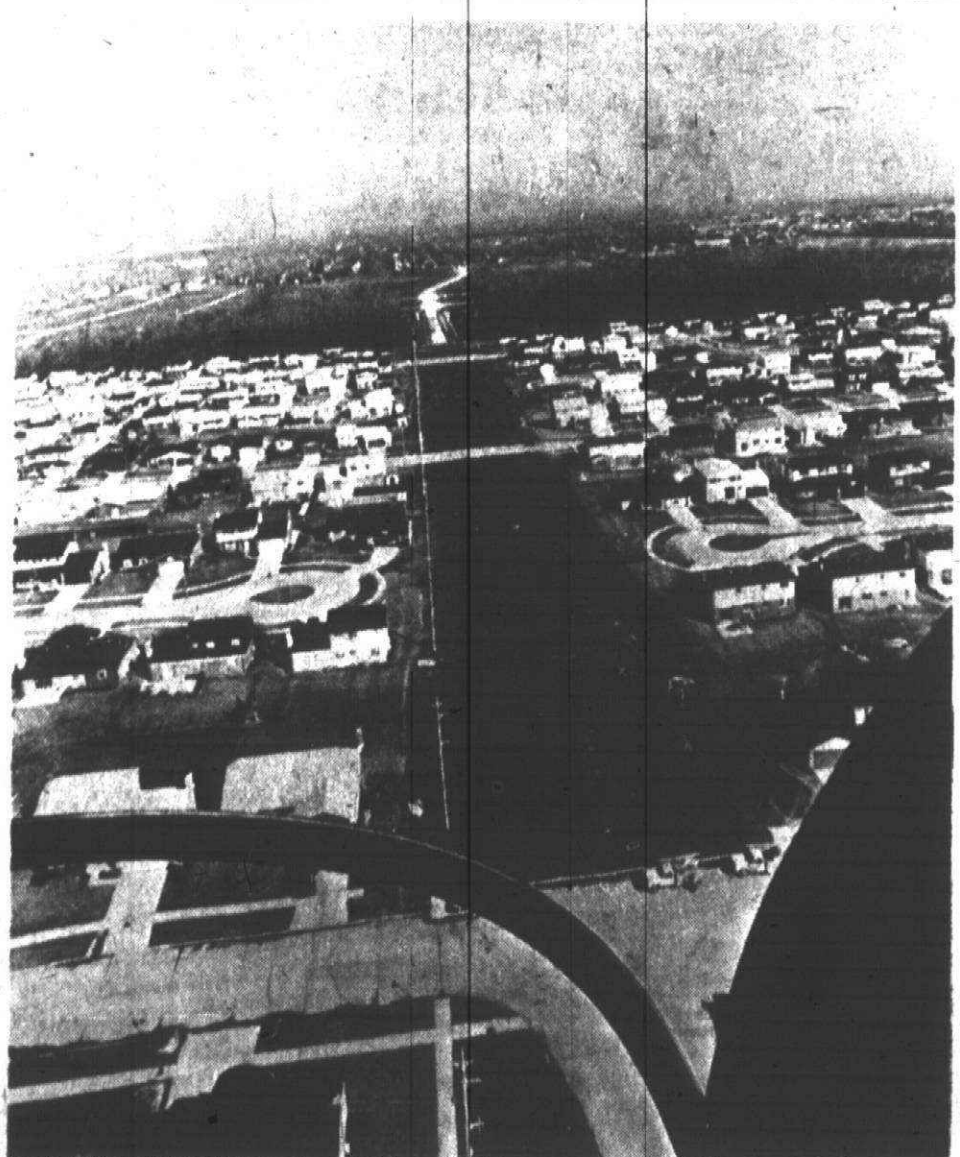

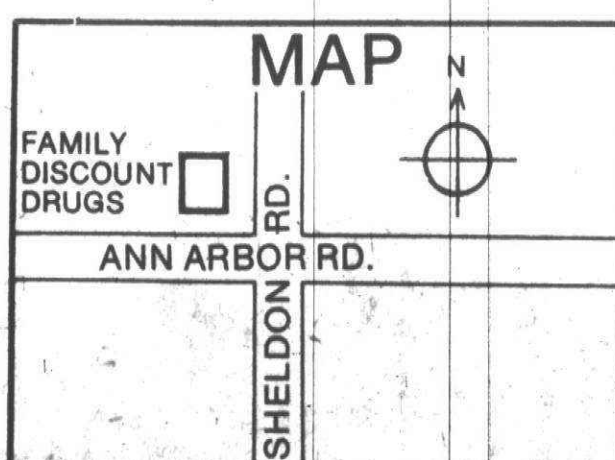

two Miller students, says his family likes 45-15 because it enables his family to take vacations during winter months. The Rupert family spent two weeks in Florida last January and plan to travel to California next month.

"This is ideal for us," he said, "because I can't get vacations in the summer. The children like 45-15 too. At the end of their three-week break, they get antsy enough that they want to go back to school."

Canton mother Teri John works as a substitute teacher in the Wayne-Westland School District. Mrs. John and her family moved into the Miller attendance area after 45-15 was implemented.

Mrs. John said she had no problem finding a babysitter for first-grader Stephanie when she was at work and Stephanie was on break.

Her neighbors, the Rodwells, moved into Miller's attendance area last May with a kindergarten student. Mrs. Rodwell's son finished his kindergarten

year at Miller during the summer months.

"I really can't even say that it messed up our summer," Mrs. Rodwell confessed. "He used to be home from school by 2:30 and, if we wanted to, we could still go to the beach."

"He didn't mind going to school during the summer one bit. When it was hot, he used to brag that the place was air conditioned."

MRS. ROSIE CHAMPE, who has two children enrolled on 45-15, advises parents to plan ahead for pupils' three-week breaks.

"I think you have to keep a good calendar," the Canton mother said. "Last summer, we didn't do the type of things we usually do—like taking trips to the zoo. We just blinked our eyes, and the summer was over. This year, we're going to plan ahead."

"About a week before the beginning of the kids' break, I start a list of things to do on the refrigerator—even if it's just baking cookies."

Mrs. Fairchild noted one problem voiced by many Miller parents—getting children to bed at an early hour during summer months so they can get up and go to school.

"It stays light so long in the summer, and there are kids who aren't on 45-15 who are outside playing," she said. "It becomes difficult to get your kids in bed at a decent hour."

The year-round school program forced Mrs. Champe's third grader, Douglas, to drop out of a summer 'Little League' baseball program. Douglas replaced Little League with a baseball program sponsored by an inter-session recreational committee at Miller School.

Douglas didn't mind, Mrs. Champe said.

"I think children get upset when they see their parents upset," she explained. "I think it's totally in the way you present things to your children. If you're negative about something, they will be too."

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How small local grocer survives stiff competition

How can an independent grocery and market compete in this day and age with the large supermarkets? One need look no further than the McAllister Bros. Grocery on Northville Road to find the answer.

This grocery and party store has been operating at the same site for the past 32 years. The larger markets in the area have come and gone but McAllisters just goes on and on.

The reason? "I suppose it comes down to a matter of service," Pod McAllister explained. "We have been here so long that we know all of the people. Even our clerks have a record of longevity no other store can match."

He then pointed out that Earl Harrison has been with him for 27 years and Ted Byers has been on the job for 26 years.

"These two fellows, along with my brother, Jack, and my wife, Lois, make this a five-person operation. And this record of service, plus the fact that we are on a first name basis with many of our customers is a great help."

Standing behind the counter, Pod,

sort of glorying in the success, said, "Would you believe that we cash a couple hundred personal checks each week? That is something not done by the larger markets. And we have had very, very few cases of bad checks."

As he told of the successful operation, Pod turned back the clock to the close of 1945 when the grocery store was born.

"I had just come out of the Navy and with my brother, Jack, we decided to open a store. We purchased the property from my dad and we built the place ourselves. It was quite a job, but we did it without a contractor."

"From the start we decided on a policy of paying cash for everything. And I have to laugh now when I recall how we used to race to the bank every Friday afternoon to cover the checks we had written during the week."

"After we got started and were on the way, Ed Holdsworth, another of the chaps with whom I went to school, joined our group and we get along just dan dy."

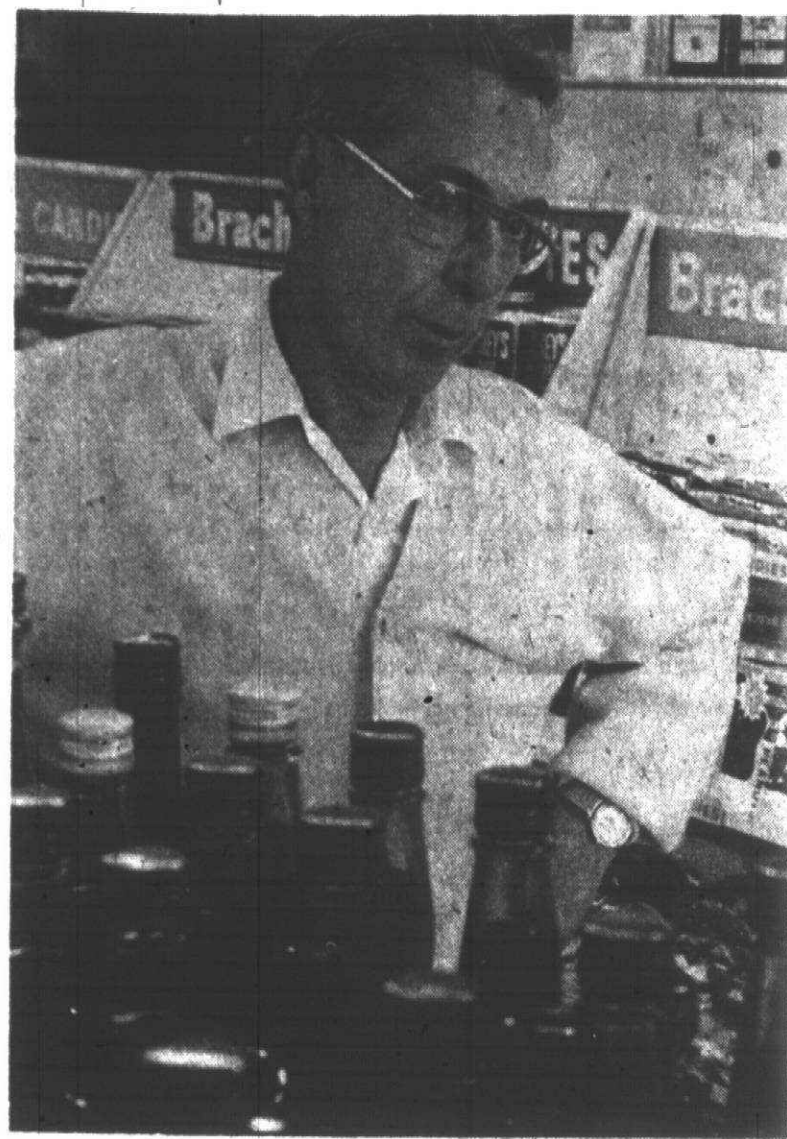
Pod admits it wasn't easy staying off the larger markets and firms with whom they were doing business.

"Many of them wanted to put up big displays in the store and then charge us for them," he said. "I always refused and asked that I get half of the amount and pay cash. That way I knew that our inventory was at the close of each year."

Inmates start fire in DeHoCo cottage

There were some tense hours Sunday for inmates and officials at the Women's Division of the Detroit House of Corrections (DeHoCo) when two separate fires created a panic in the maximum security cottage.

Both fires were set by inmates, according to Martha Wheeler, DeHoCo director. She said order was restored almost three hours after the first fire occurred.

One of the inmates started a fire in her room in the maximum security barracks at 2:15 p.m., apparently as a diversion to cover an escape attempt. Ms. Wheeler said. But correctional officers immediately noticed the fire and put it out before any damage was done.

After the first fire, a second maximum security inmate "who had been under psychiatric observation," according to Ms. Wheeler, set fire to her bed mattress.

"Fortunately, the mattress was a special fire-resistant kind, so it didn't catch fire," Ms. Wheeler said. "But it did smolder, and the cottage filled up with smoke."

Several inmates became excited and started shouting after the barracks' rooms were evacuated.

"You have to remember, this cottage houses our most troublesome prisoners," said Ms. Wheeler. "and we didn't want anything to happen."

Michigan State Police patrol cars arrived at the cottage as a security measure, but the tactic backfired.

"As soon as the women saw the police uniforms, they got even more excited and got ready to fight and started shouting. It's a perfectly natural reaction," the director said.

When he arrived a half hour after the first fire was set, inmates in the cottage were yelling demands at the staff, a state police officer said.

"Apparently when something like this happened before there were a number of transfers. And apparently the prisoners thought it might happen again," the officer said. "They were shouting that they wouldn't be moved, and that their families had to be notified and things like that."

Ms. Wheeler stated that although there was shouting and confusion the only fight occurred at 4:30 p.m. when one inmate attacked a prison official with her fists. However, the fight was restrained by police officers before anyone was hurt.

Water bills to rise in city April 1

Water bills in the City of Plymouth are expected to go up 20 per cent for most users, effective April 1.

Monday night the Plymouth City Commission approved the first reading of an ordinance to adjust the rates upward and announced its intentions to give final approval on March 21.

Water bills will go up because of an increase in the sewage consumption charge, a rate based on the amount of water used, which is included in the water bill.

For the average homeowner who uses 20,000 gallons of water a year, explains City Mgr. Fred Yockey, the increase will cost about \$4.80 more per year or \$1.20 per quarter.

The increase is necessary to overcome continued deficits in the sewer fund, he explained. "We have had deficits in the sewer fund for the past three years and without rate adjustments we'd reach a deficit of more than \$30,000 by June, 1978."

WAYNE COUNTY is increasing its sewage disposal charge to the city by 13 per cent—from 14 to 16 cents per 1,000 gallons.

The city commission proposes to raise its sewer charge an additional six cents per 1,000 gallons (a seven

per cent increase) to cover the accumulating deficit.

The adjustment will increase the city's sewage disposal rates from 29 to 35 cents per 1,000 gallons.

Without the rate adjustment, explained Yockey, the city's sewage deficit would continue at about \$25,000 per year.

"Actually, the rates should have been increased last year by the city, but we were still in a recession and so I recommended that we only pass on the increased charge to the city from the county. Now we are going to receive a 13 per cent hike from the county and need to increase the charge another seven per cent to offset our operating deficits."

The minimum water bill charge now is \$5.15 per quarter for a homeowner using 18,000 gallons or less per quarter. The minimum charge will now go up to \$6.23 per 18,000 gallons with a 35 cent charge for every 1,000 gallons consumed above that minimum.

The city's sewer fund lost \$16,654 for the year ended June, 1974; a loss of \$14,342 for 1975; and a loss of \$141 for the year ended June 30, 1976.

The hike of six cents per 1,000 gallons is expected to produce an additional \$26,190 in revenue.

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
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

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Plymouth Township OKs study of police options

The Plymouth Township board Tuesday directed Supervisor Thomas Notebaert to "explore all available options" for providing police protection after June 30. The date when county funding of the Sheriff's Road Patrol is terminated. This came despite objections from Trustee Frank Millington.

Pointing out that the last police study was done in 1974, Notebaert had asked board members for an informal discussion to give him some idea of their feelings as to how the issue of police protection should be approached.

Notebaert's request marked the first time the police question has come before the trustees since the Michigan Supreme Court's refusal last month to hear an appeal of a lower court ruling which stated that out-county townships had to pay for the Sheriff's Road Patrol.

The overwhelming board opinion favored an update of the police study and a thorough exploration of the costs involved in negotiating contracts with Wayne County and the City of Plymouth and in establishing a combined townships' police force.

In addition the possibility of asking township residents to approve millage to begin a police department was mentioned by several members.

THE ONLY DISSENTING opinion was expressed by Millington. He argued that the Sheriffs would continue to protect the township, and only the

regular patrol would be eliminated.

"Only patrolling will not be in effect, but the county has to protect us. We pay for protection and we are going to get it. We are not faced with a dire emergency. There is no need to do anything," He maintained that police couldn't stop crime unless they were on the scene, and their visible presence was not that crucial.

Trustee Richard Gornick, citing an increase in township crime statistics, disagreed with Millington. "Police visibility is an important factor. We can't think that they are in a building somewhere and will be there when we need them. That is rural thinking."

"Breaking and entering are up in the township... Crime follows the expressways. We can't get by on less protection than we have now with our growth increases." He added that the township should not put itself in the position of having to react with little or no information but should be prepared to act.

Clerk Helen Richardson agreed with Gornick. It was true, she said, that crime solving was done in labs, but visibility is important. "Let's bring the police study up to date. Let's contact the City of Plymouth to see if we can get a reasonable estimate and contact the Sheriff's department. We can also find out about joint protection with other townships."

Notebaert said he would follow the suggestions and report his findings back to the board in 30 days.

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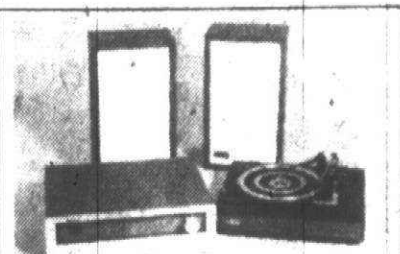

Schoolcraft receives vocational grant

Schoolcraft College has received a \$90,000 grant to develop coordinated programs for high school vocational students who want to continue their career development at the community college.

Dean Ted Diebel, who heads Schoolcraft's applied sciences division, says the project was jointly developed and proposed by the college and the directors of vocational education in the five K-12 member districts. The grant is funded by the federal government

through the Michigan Department of Education.

CALLED THE "Articulation Project," it will focus on five target career programs which have significant similarity in the 10 public high schools within the college district.

Administrators, faculty and counselors from Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools will be among those having input to the development of coordinated programs of study to enable the student to transfer to Schoolcraft without unnecessary duplication of learning effort or costly loss of educational time.

The college has been taking applications for a project director and hopes to name one by April 1.

DIEBEL SAID that developing the project proposal had been a rewarding effort for him and the district vocational education directors.

He credited Harold Gaertner of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools as being among five directors providing valuable input.

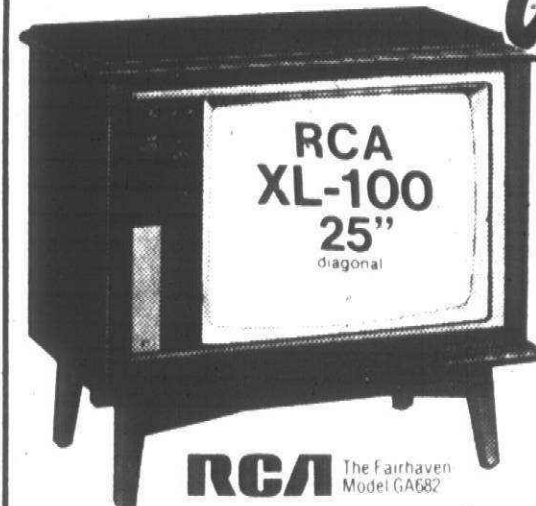
The project is expected to run for three years with funding for the second and third years equal to the initial \$90,000 grant.

The discussion on absenteeism in the high schools has probably overlooked the most obvious question and the simplest answer.

The question—why do students skip class—has been asked but very few have suggested that students are skipping because they don't have any incentive to be in class. It's almost too simple to state that students are skipping because there's no motivation to attend class.

But sometimes simple answers contain the greatest amount of truth. It makes more sense to me, for instance, to credit lack of motivation as a cause than to blame parents' indifference. And lack of motivation seems like a much more plausible explanation than the modular scheduling system.

While I don't intend to defend modular scheduling in this column, I do wish to emphatically state my belief that it's quite naive to believe elimination of modular scheduling will eliminate the attendance problem. If you reinstate traditional scheduling at the high schools, students will still skip classes. You can fence the school site and put padlocks on the doors if you wish but students still will skip classes.

In fact, you can play with schedules all you like and will accomplish little towards substantially reducing absenteeism because you aren't getting close to treating the cause.

THROUGHOUT THE HISTORY of public education students have cut classes. You did and I did. And we cut classes because we didn't want to be there. It's that simple.

I cut phys ed classes because I couldn't do gymnastics. I cut typing class because it was boring repetitious work. I cut biology because bloody pictures sickened my stomach.

But I never missed English literature classes, even with the extensive memorization of Shakespeare, because the instructor held us all captives with his motivational skills.

And my high school had a very traditional schedule and curriculum.

But traditional schedules and curriculums, or strict discipline, didn't keep us in classes. We were skilled at beating the system—skilled enough to beat down any system. But we weren't stupid enough to miss a good

thing—an exciting class with a teacher who could stimulate in us a love for learning. No system could beat down a good teacher or keep us out of an exciting class.

I WOULDN'T PRETEND to place the blame for absenteeism at the hands of the faculty. That's unfair and makes little sense.

In fact I don't really care to blame anyone.

But I cannot overlook the assumption that if students were highly motivated, if learning was exciting, if teachers were skilled in capitalizing on student interests, and subject matters made relevant, there would be a very small problem with attendance at the high schools.

And to suggest that absenteeism is a problem because students aren't motivated isn't to place all the responsibility on the faculty. After all, the school board must establish standards for instruction and followup to insure they are followed. The administration, when hiring teachers, has a responsibility to recruit teachers who possess motivational skills as well as knowledge of subject matter. Our children are taught by whom we choose to hire. And by whom we choose to retain.

In closing, remember that the student also has responsibility for learning. A student who wants to learn can overcome all barriers. While it would be ideal to build ladders instead of barriers, students can climb over barriers as well as they can climb up steps. Learning is an individual task which the student must pursue. We should do all that is possible to make learning exciting. But once done the responsibility rests solely on the learner who then must choose. That choice cannot be made by adults, no matter how hard we try.

Traffic signal to be added

A new traffic light has been authorized for the intersection of Ann Arbor Trail and Union at the southeast corner of Kellogg Park.

The improvements are being financed with matching 90-10 federal funds, with the city's share about \$4,500.

The commission will decide in the near future whether to spend an additional \$16,000 on equipment to synchronize all traffic signals in the downtown area. If the city makes the additional investment, lights would be synchronized along Main Street at the intersections of Church, Penniman Avenue, Ann Arbor Trail and Wing.

Will friendly persuasion halt TV violence?

Many parents and PTA organizations are talking these days about violence on television and its effects on children.

Although debate on the subject is very confusing and very likely to be affected by notions of self-interest, there are by now enough facts established to disturb any thinking person.

- Kids watch a lot of television. One University of Pennsylvania study reported that parents said their children watched TV an average of 2.55 hours per day, while the children watching themselves said they watched 5.88 hours daily. If the kids are right, that's more time in a seven-day week than they spend in school.

- A three-year study of television violence completed in 1972 by the Office of the Surgeon-General of the United States reported two basic findings: first, that TV violence instigates more violence among the children who watch it; second, that watching TV violence was cathartic for children.

For example, Billy Paddirson, who is a fourth-grader at Livonia's Lincoln Elementary School, thinks police stories are the best kind of TV show.

"You just get used to seeing people get killed," he says.

- There is a lot of violence on TV, as if anybody didn't know that. Two MSU professors, Bradley R. Greenberg and Charles Atkin, analyzed the violence in prime time shows as well as Saturday morning cartoon shows for kids. They concluded that there were an average of 45 prosocial acts per hour in the 8-9 p.m. family hour, against an average of 42 antisocial acts per hour.

But television shows on Saturday morning, when the kids are likely to be watching TV while their parents run errands or clean out the attic, chalked up an average of 50 antisocial acts per hour against only 20 prosocial acts per hour.

ANOTHER problem concerning parents and teachers is the degree to which watching TV dulls a child's imagination and reduces interest in reading. Teachers are reporting students who cannot understand simple stories without seeing visual illustrations of the action, and they ascribe this to watching television.

"I'd rather watch TV than read a book," says Ed Lutz, a fifth grader at Lincoln. "They show you the pictures."

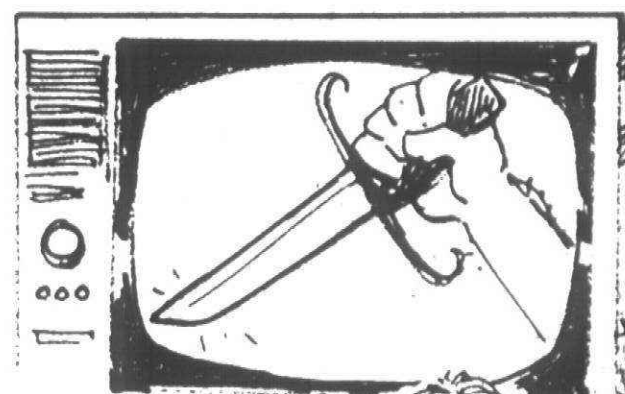
Gerald Lessing and Edward Palmer of the Children's Workshop, which created "Sesame Street" and "The Electric Company," disagree. They argue their shows have successfully combined education with entertainment.

"Children expect television to be interesting," says Lessing, "and if it isn't, they don't watch."

This may be true, parents and teachers reply, but there's a big difference between "Sesame Street" and the Saturday morning cartoons or "Starsky and Hutch."



...but OPEN MINDS



SOONER OR later, the argument is bound to come to a head.

The national Parent-Teacher Association has started a nationwide campaign to bring the problems of violence on TV to public attention. Grass roots hearings have been held in various places around the country, and the subject may well be discussed at the Michigan state PTA convention next month, according to district director Phyllis Lyons.

The PTA organization is hoping to visit officials at the three television networks to convince them to tone down violence. Hearings on the subject are under way in Washington, and although nearly everybody who testified agreed that TV violence was bad for children, nobody really knew what to do.

The PTA hopes friendly persuasion will work, but if it does not, they're prepared to think about organizing boycotts of those products which sponsor especially violent shows.

I THINK the attention directed toward TV violence makes a lot of sense. It's the first time there has been organized direct public attention toward the subtle but undeniable effect TV has on all of us.

When former vice-president Spiro Agnew attacked the news media in general and TV in particular as controlled by a small elite, he may have been wrong about the news, but he surely put his finger on a wide-spread subject of public concern.

The day when TV networks and sponsors can control the content of programs directed toward us or our children ought to be over—the sooner the better.

Keep it up, PTA'ers!

Student drinking

A 2d way to skin a cat

Those who would raise Michigan's drinking age from 18 to either 19 or 21 usually rely on two types of arguments.

First, they contend the accident rate for drivers aged 18-20 has soared since the age of majority was lowered in 1972. In past columns, I've tried to demonstrate that many police statistics on this subject are hokey and unconvincing, but my mind is still open.

Second, school superintendents say they have discipline problems with 18 year olds who come to class half-looped or buy beer for younger kids.

AS THE PERSON who in 1969 sold Gov. William Milliken the idea of setting up an Age of Majority Commission, I have to challenge the superintendents on their remedy.

Is the answer to take away from 18 year olds the right to drink? Or is the answer to speed up the curriculum so that kids get out of school a year or two earlier?

In selling the revised age of majority change in the early '70s, I can recall being specific on that point: Kids are maturing physically a lot faster than a century ago; brain development and mental maturity are related to physical maturity; and not only would we have to lower the legal ages of contracts, voting, jury duty, drinking, work rules and legal responsibilities, but we would also have to lower the age at which kids get out of high school.

I'm convinced we are forcing many young people to stay in school more years than they want to. I'm convinced that one reason is to keep 'em out of the labor force and reduce competition for jobs. I'm convinced another reason is to make work for teachers, a very powerful lobby.

JOHN HOLT, author of "How Children Learn" and "How Children Fail," brushed across this general topic in an article he once wrote called "School Is Bad for Children." Holt didn't specifically say the curriculum should be speeded up, but he did say this:

"To keep kids in school who would rather not

be there costs the schools an enormous amount of time and trouble—to say nothing of what it costs to repair the damage that these angry and resentful prisoners do every time they get a chance.

"Kids caught in the college rush more often than not work 70 hours or more a week, most of it on paper busywork. For kids who aren't going to college, school is just a useless time waster, preventing them from earning some money or doing some useful work, or even doing some true learning."

Holt advocated abolishing the rigid curriculum, rigid attendance rules and the rigid requirement that only ordained teachers can teach. But I would extend his argument a step and suggest that persons of age 18 are just too old to be in high school.

I CAN SAY with some authority that the idea of speeding up the curriculum to get kids out of school a year or two younger was an inherent part of the age of majority proposal. But so far, no one in the education industry seems to want to discuss it.

The education industry will vigorously oppose the idea because it may cost teachers jobs, and they're already frantically trying to think up ways to make kids stick to school. So be it.

But the idea of compressing the curriculum still has merit. It's not as simplistic a route as raising the drinking age, but in the long run it may be fairer to our young adults.

'Ability to pay' taxes punishes the middle class

I spent the weekend going through the annual battle of pulling my income tax information together in preparation for filing my tax return.

Figuring out your income tax in the United States is a complicated procedure. You spend a lot less time figuring out what your income is and then applying your tax. You spend most of your time figuring out what can be used to offset income to reduce your tax.

Reformers like to call this "looking for loopholes" among the very wealthy. In reality, these deductions and exemptions have more effect on what the poor pay or don't pay than the wealthy on a percentage basis.

The biggest single "loophole" in terms of cost to the government is the exemption of \$750 per dependent of which everyone takes advantage.

What disturbs me is that the American people have accepted the philosophy that taxes should be based on "ability to pay." I have said many times in this column that the problem with ability to pay is those who have no ability to pay demand more services to be paid by those with the ability to pay, and there is no justice. Eventually you eliminate those with the ability to pay.

We end up getting more and more government for more and more taxes, but not necessarily better government.

TO SHOW YOU that the ability to pay theory has no justification for taxes, just ask the politicians who advocate it if it should be applied in the marketplace. Of course they would be against it because, with consumers rights, everyone must be treated fairly.

Ability to pay is more insidious. It takes away earned capital which could be used to create or enlarge businesses which would create new jobs, certainly a high priority in this day and age.

America is the greatest country in the world, and it didn't get that way because of socialist concepts. It was built on the principle of government of the people, by the people, for the people.

And it was built on the principle that capitalists produce jobs. It was built on the principle that the person who worked hardest got the biggest rewards.

America is not a country of the very rich and the very poor. It is a country of predominantly middle class people. Because of our inheritance tax laws, it is a country of very little inherited wealth.

It is also a land of opportunity where everybody has the chance to gain an education and to use his skills to become a success.

Obviously the school board didn't particularly care about our feelings toward this procedure as this questionnaire was to be returned to the boundaries committee by March 15. The school board has already adopted random selection, as of the board meeting on Feb. 28, to be implemented in the fall of 1977.

•Why was random selection adopted rather than boundary changes?

•Have statistics proven random selection to be successful and if so what are they?

•Have the school board members considered the social and emotional adjustments that the young adults must make within their new peer groups?

•Are you not separating the friendships of many young students which have developed through their elementary, middle school years, and subsequently straining neighborhood relationships?

•When does the young adult begin to develop his loyalties? Haven't allegiances been developed long before entering high school?

•Why do the eighth grade students having brothers and/or sisters presently in high school have the choice of which school they may attend?

•What is the justification to the community school concept?

•Are you destroying each young adult's identity that has been created through past school years?

•What about the counselors and class assignments already made for the student?

•How is this going to affect our young students' attitudes towards school?

•How does this affect our athletic program?

Now that we have raised these questions, can you, in all good conscience, stand on your decision of adopting random selection?

Would you still like us to return this questionnaire? We supposedly have until March 15?

Student station will apply for federal \$

WSDP, the high school radio station, has been given the okay to apply for a federal grant, that, if successful, will enable the station to increase its broadcasting power and purchase new equipment.

The board of education voted unanimously last week to grant the station's request to spend \$69,000 to increase its operating capacity.

Under the conditions of U.S. Office of Education grant, the federal government will provide 75 per cent of the money. The school district will have

to pick up the remaining 25 per cent, or approximately \$23,000.

According to Sam Ulsaker, administrative assistant for federal projects, the station would use the money to increase its wattage from 10 to 300 and extend the broadcasting hours from eight to 18.

The station presently has a broadcasting distance of about a two mile radius," explained Ulsaker. "If we get the grant, we will be able to increase our distance to somewhere between a five and 10 mile radius."

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Borowski concerned

Editor:

I share many of the concerns of parents and appreciate their input on these matters.

Reporting has long been a source of concern and one that we are continually attempting to perfect. Our elementary reporting system clearly reflects individual teacher styles and standards.

Fortunately, a child's elementary and middle school records do not continually haunt the child. Our goal is to have highly individualized reporting that measures the child against himself only and not against other children in the class.

We definitely need to do a better job of providing options within each school building so that we can fit each child's learning style with a teacher's teaching style. All children do not learn in the same way and we must provide for these individual differences within each building. Clearly, we have a long way to go on this.

Extended school years does not mean an automatic open classroom situation. The research that you refer to is familiar to me. While I would agree that open classrooms are not the answer for all children, they do meet a need for some and often they do succeed.

OUR HIGH SCHOOL system is far from perfect. I emphatically agree that we need to provide more alternatives for our high school students than we do now. We plan to have at least one additional alternative available next year (a small, highly structured school).

We are also about to initiate some new measures to make sure that children will get to class and resource centers. Although this does not excuse our very real problems, we find that all the other high schools in the area experience attendance problems even worse than our own (as do places of employment).

It is a sign of our times that I do not like and would welcome any assistance in finding some answers.

Our recent outside, independent study by Wayne State University of our modular system has shown us the considerable cost-savings involved in our program over that of a traditional program. I know Livonia abandoned theirs for cost reasons, but our experience has been the opposite.

Also, we have had no success in enrolling students to a traditional program beyond the 10th grade. Perhaps our alternative school will answer this need.

WE WILL BE greatly expanding our extended school year program next year. As the need arises (probably the following year) we will move to an extended day at the high schools to accommodate more students.

Yet even with these measures, we still need additional buildings to accommodate the growth in this area. We must plan ahead and have these buildings ready when needed.

In addition, much of the bond project will go for major repairs, renovation, remodeling and air-conditioning of extended school year needs. There are no funds for an additional high school in this project. Also, should growth slacken off, we will not build the full contingent of buildings. We are committed to not overbuilding.

Naturally, I hope to have parents' support on the upcoming millage and bond issue. We cannot improve our programs, provide options, or even implement extended school year without these funds.

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Gala party, silver gowns mark Vivians' anniversary

The Plymouth Vivians Club was organized March 5, 1952 with 38 charter members. They celebrated their 25th anniversary Saturday night with a gala champagne reception and dinner at the Plymouth Elks Club on Ann Arbor Road.

The club now has 211 members. Eleven past presidents attended the party.

The first president was Marion Creith; the 25th is Ethel Bragalone. All presidents wore silver gowns for the occasion.

Lois Lane who chaired the party explained the purpose of the club:

"A charitable and social club, willing at all times to assist the Plymouth Lodge of Elks No. 1780 when assistance is requested."

THE NAME, VIVIAN, came from Charles Vivian who founded the first Elks lodge in 1867.

Charles Vivian is the accepted founder of the Elks," said Mrs. Lane, "and his surname was chosen for the club. The first members were entertainers—theatrical performers."

Mrs. Lane enumerated the projects the club has supported over the years.

"We were the first women's organization in Michigan to contribute, as a group, to the Michigan Elks' major project—aiding handicapped children. In 12 years the local Vivians donated approximately \$20,000." The club earned first place ratings five times

for the amount of money given to the state project.

Other philanthropies include: donations to the Plymouth Community Fund, a gaslamp for Kellogg Park, a lamp for Tonquish Creek Manor, an Interlochen scholarship, and sponsoring Camp Fire Girls and Girl Scout troops.

The Plymouth Vivians gave \$1,000 toward the purchase of a Plymouth Township Fire Department radio communication system. They have made donations to cancer, tuberculosis, muscular dystrophy and other medical research projects.

They give of their time as well as their money. They assist with blood banks and helped with the recent

swine flu vaccination. They visit the West Trail Nursing Home regularly, organizing a bingo game for the residents and serve refreshments. They also visit the Veterans Hospital in Allen Park.

"We have helped a lot of young handicapped people in this area," said Mrs. Lane. "People who need help—those who no other organization will help."

The anniversary was strictly a social affair—champagne, filet mignon, and professional entertainment. But there were a good many bazaars and fund-raisers behind the projects the Vivians have supported for the past 25 years.

Roles of today's women studied in workshops

Students at Plymouth Salem High School joined women on campuses across the nation in recognition of International Women's Day, March 8.

A sampling of two of the workshops revealed the quality of the programming and the difficulty involved in deciding which to attend. Three sessions were in progress at the same time.

The workshop on rape and the panel on women in Europe and Latin America were scheduled for the morning series.

THE WORKSHOP on rape, conducted by two representatives of the Women's Crisis Center in Ann Arbor, produced several "dos" and "don'ts."

Do run to a nearby house and shout

"rape," or if there is no light on in the house, smash a window, shout "fire."

Do use the keys on your key ring as a weapon. With the keys protruding between your fingers, you have made-to-order brass knuckles with which you can inflict painful injuries.

Do tell your family or friends when you expect to be home or arrive at your destination.

And do accept an offer from a friend to walk you home—two are safer than one.

The Crisis Center women cited situations when a would-be assailant was foiled by unexpected behavior. One woman began to eat grass; another yelled at her attacker in German; another disarmed the man, literally, by

grabbing his knife.

They advised not to "try talking them out of it." It does not work. And they said they did not recommend the book "How to say no to a Rapist and Survive."

A PANEL OF WOMEN from Europe and South America fielded questions about the state of womanhood in their countries.

Eliana Loveluck was born in Chile. She came to Ann Arbor in 1963 when her father came to the University of Michigan as an instructor.

At first, the family returned to Chile to visit. Their last trip was in 1973, "before the coup," and they have not been back since then.

She said education was encouraged in Chile. There are women in politics and non-traditional jobs. There is separation of the sexes in the public schools. Some of the private schools are co-educational but the students wear uniforms at both schools.

"The middle class is really the most privileged," said Ms. Loveluck. "The husband's salary is small so the wife works too. There are daycare centers for the children."

She said the schools are politically active. Many women are involved in leftist politics but none are in positions of responsibility within the movement.

"When you are 21, you are considered an adult. But you live at home until you are married. Young women are given more responsibility when they reach 21."

looked down on as "half a man."

Women did not get the right to vote until 1970, "but still do not have the right to vote on community affairs."

Susan was the only girl to take science and math in her high school class in Switzerland.

There are no girls athletics in the schools. "Everyone takes three hours of gym each week. There are no after school sports—nothing organized. Soccer is the big sport and girls don't play soccer."

"Everyone spends one week at ski camp and the government pays for half of that."

She said the young people do not marry until their late 20s.

She concluded there were many laws in her country which discriminated against women. "There is a lot to do."

BIRGIT MULLER of West Germany is an exchange student.

She said the average age for marriage is 23 but it varies for the different classes.

"Women do have educational choices, but it is difficult."

She said the ideal situation would be, "Behave as people—not as male and female. We're all human, and equal."

BIRGETTA STAWE and Martina Zulin represented Sweden on the panel. They also are foreign exchange students.

Although there are no cheerleaders, no special uniforms, no crowds to watch them, the Swedish girls participate in sports.

Both played basketball and volleyball when they were at home but these were extracurricular activities. The sports clubs are not part of the schools.

"There is no publicity and no prize money," for women's sports.

The Swedish students believed American high school girls are marriage-oriented. "Twenty is no age to get married. It is important for a woman to have a job. They marry in their late 20s in Sweden."

Women are involved in the government—22 per cent of the government officials are women.

The boys attend child care classes in school and when a child is born both the father and mother are eligible to receive compensation while they stay at home to care for the baby.

THE SIXTH MEMBER of the panel was Nisho, born in Guiana.

She explained that her parents were Indians and she is a Moslem. She said half the population of Guiana is Indian and the other half black.

"A bright girl can continue her education and become whatever she chooses. And when she marries, she is expected to be a super woman, continuing with her career and family, doing both well."

She left home when she was 18 and after six months in Winnipeg, moved to Ann Arbor where earned her bachelor's and master's degrees.

Women's Day activities credit to student planners

International Women's Day, the first series of workshops independently run and organized by students at the Centennial Education Park, focusing on all aspects of women today, was attended by students, staff and guests on Tuesday.

Fifteen hour-long workshops were presented in the social studies wing of Plymouth Salem High School.

Three of the workshops—women in Europe and Latin America, sexism in advertising, and sexism in popular music—were run entirely by students. The remaining 12 featured guest speakers from various professions.

The student-taught workshops were an outgrowth from a minorities class, which studies the impressions of a number of groups on society. Students planned the day's events on their independent study time.

"It's one thing to pass tests and know the subject matter," said Steve Williams, CEP social studies teacher, "but to teach ideas and persuade fellow students is another."

"We spent a lot of time preparing these girls with the skills to teach. I think an important part of an educa-

tion is to prepare students to manage things for themselves."

WILLIAMS WAS pleased with the sexism in advertising workshop. Run by Lori Scappaticci, Diane Schoenrath, Jean Partin, Linda Dudley and Jeanine Caesar, the workshop described advertising as depicting women as inferior to men.

"Women are used as objects to catch the consumer's attention in advertising," Ms. Caesar said. "All of the beautiful models used in advertising lead women to believe that beauty counts first and brains second."

A running debate surfaced between the classroom of students and the lecturers on the reasons why advertisers insist on illustrating tempting poses of women to sell a product.

One male student attending the workshop said, "Advertisers are only giving the public what it wants. If they could sell products without having to show women's bodies, they would."

Williams raised the social question of whether advertisers have the right to brainwash children in order to sell products. Some of the ads discussed that limited women to weak roles in society were for mattresses, tooth-

pastes and deodorants.

Another workshop on family planning featured Paula Weinbaum and Marcy Bohm, coordinators of the Ann Arbor Free People's Clinic. The two women discussed birth control methods, the female anatomy and the reproductive system.

Michigan is one of only two states in the U.S. that forbids its school paid employees to talk to students about birth control methods, according to Ms. Weinbaum. Students response to the family planning workshop was heavy, with many questions answered.

ATTENDANCE WAS better than Williams anticipated. "At least 12 of the 15 workshops had more people than there was room for," he said. "We weren't prepared for the number of students that came to the Perspectives of Black Women workshop. More than 300 people filled the auditorium for the lecture."

All of the workshops drew well except for Women in U.S. History. "Maybe we should have used another name instead of history," Williams quipped.

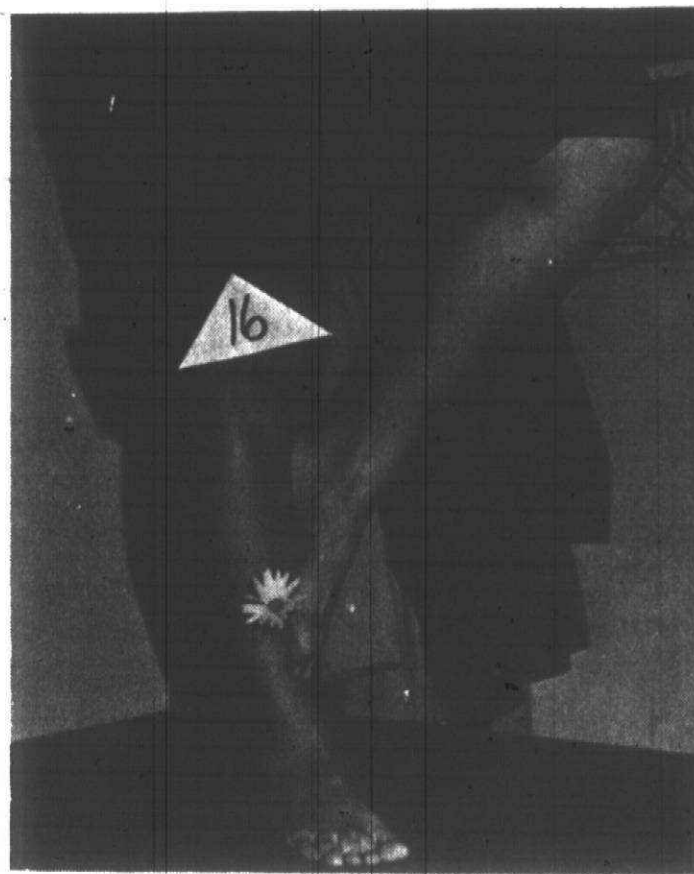

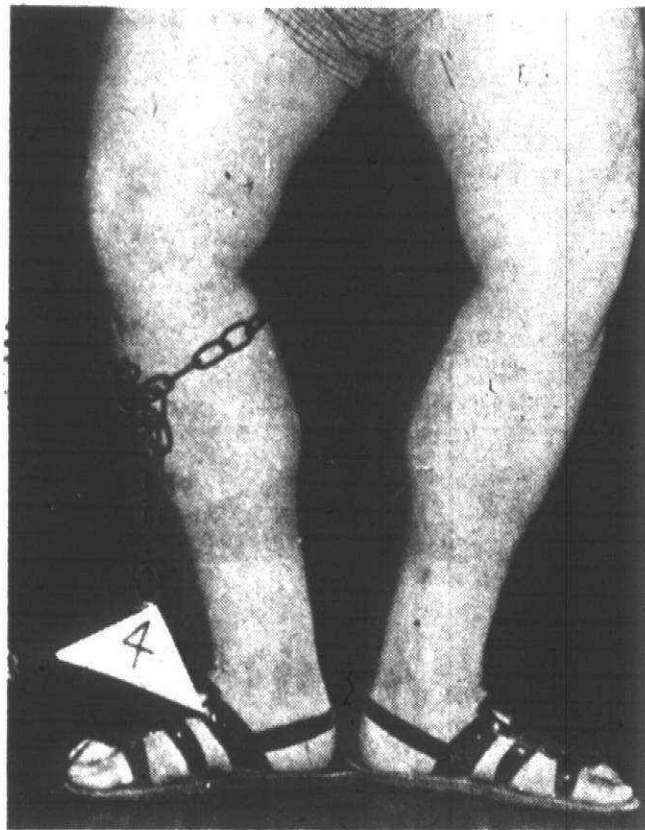

The Open Forum is free and open to the public. It will be held in Room B200 of the Liberal Arts Building.

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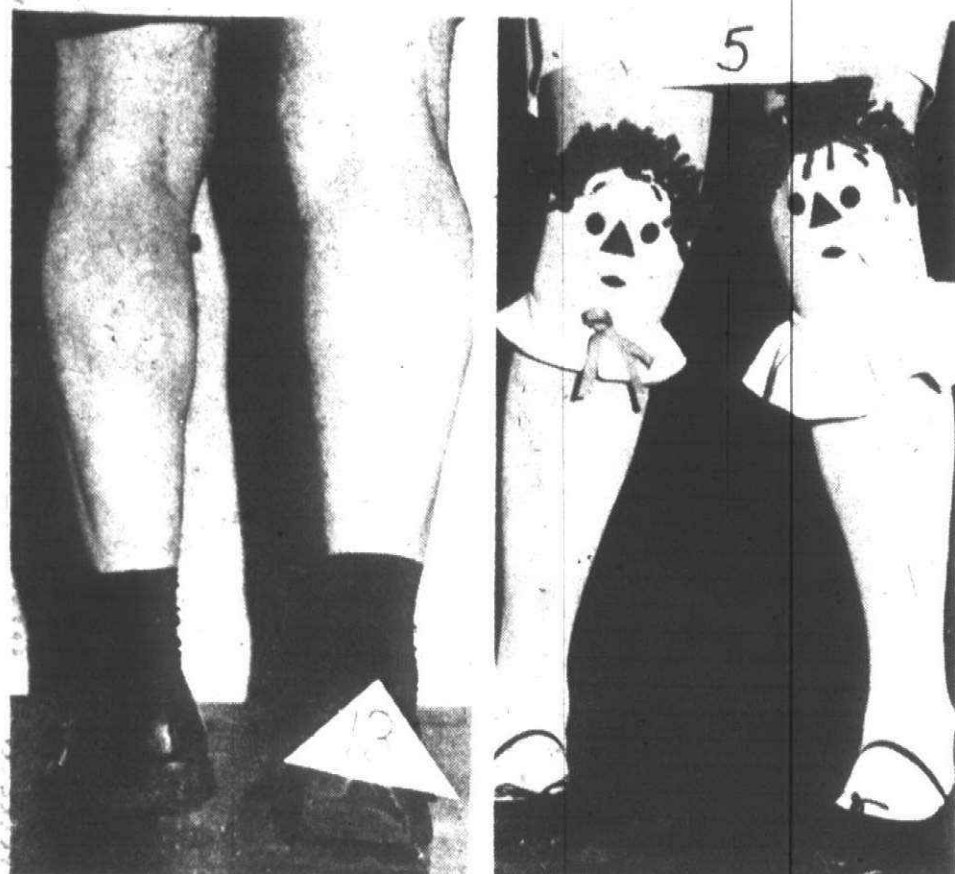
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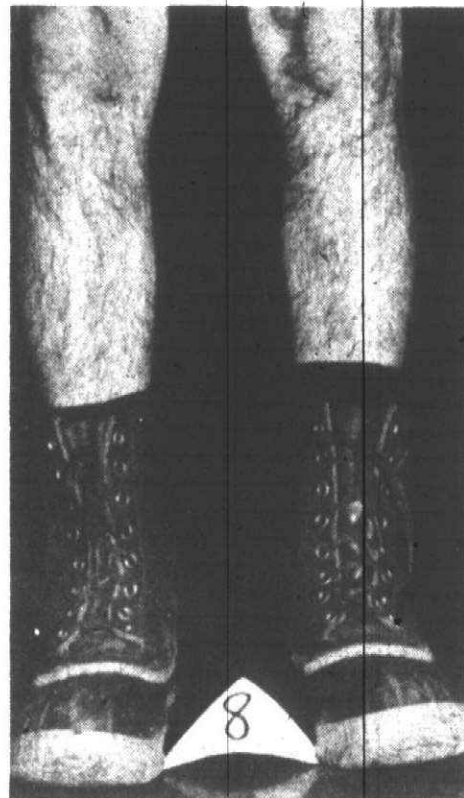
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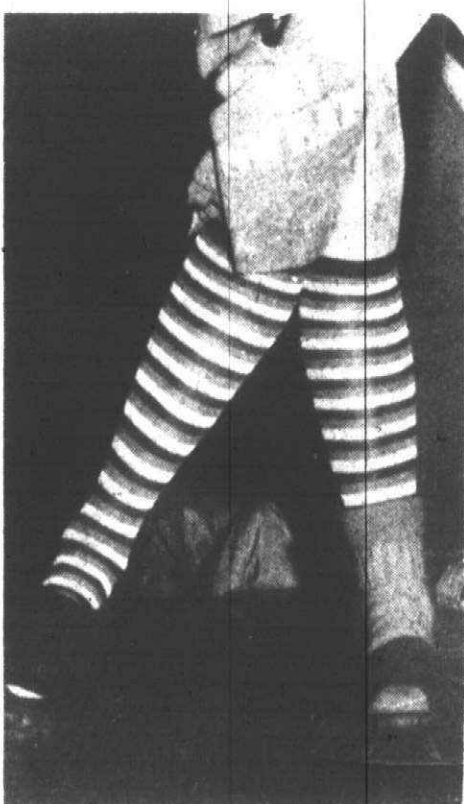
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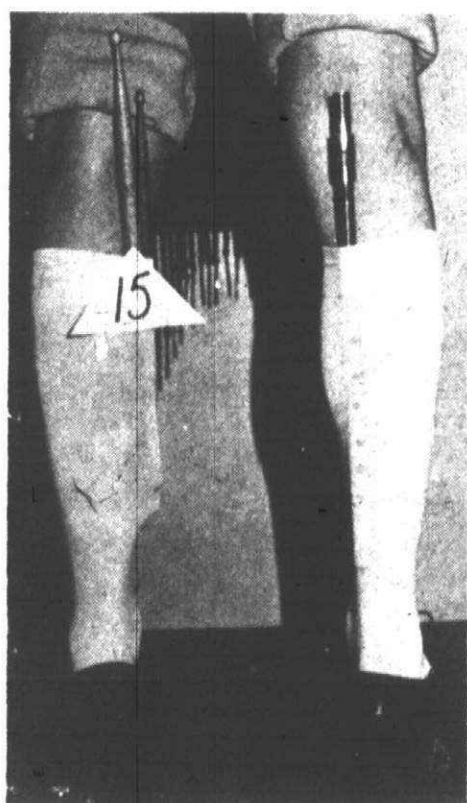
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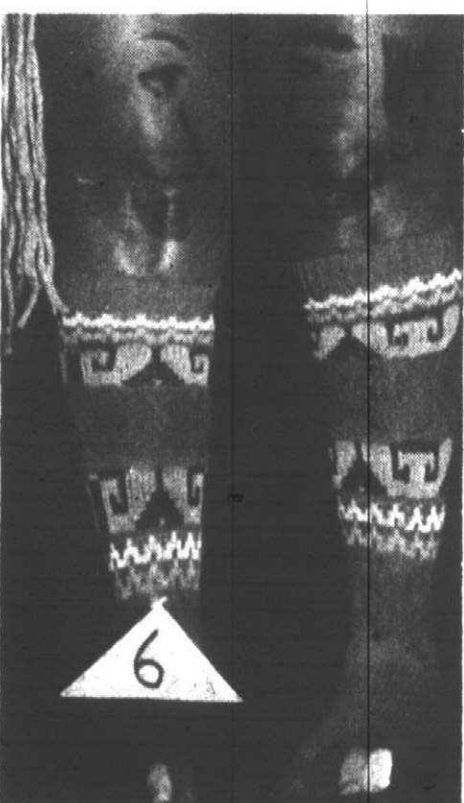
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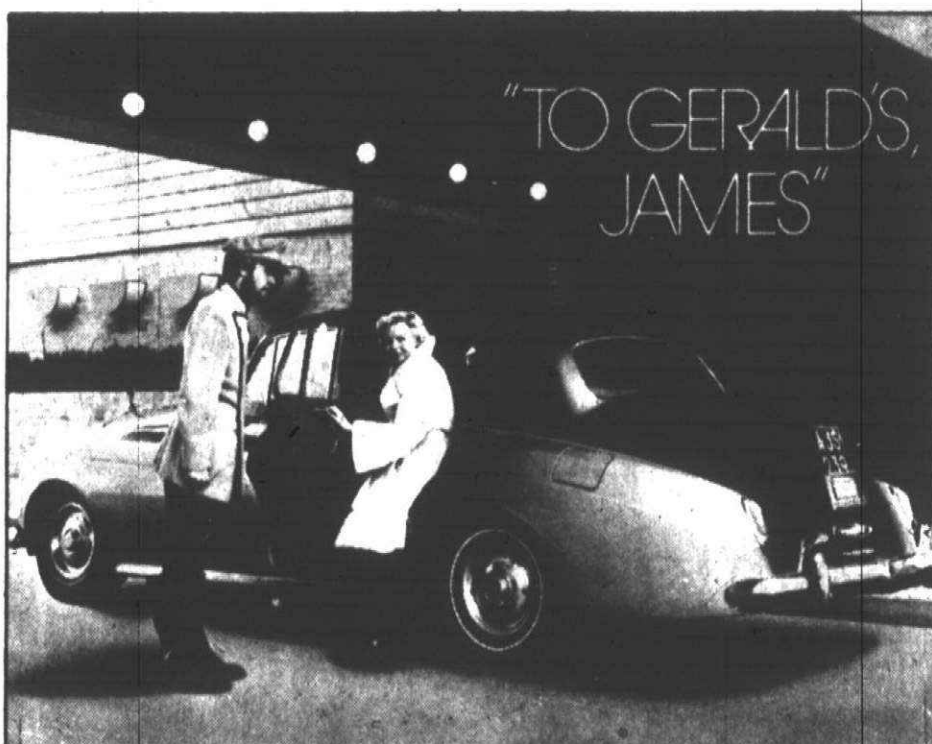
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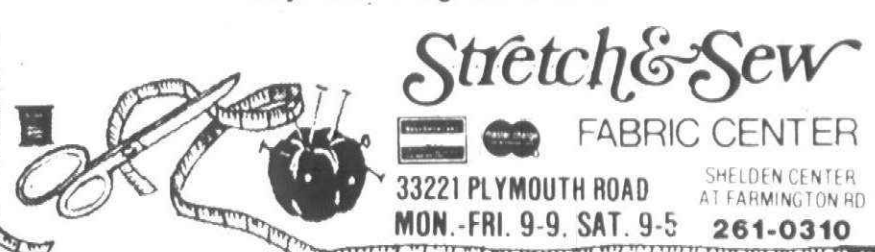
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The Stroller

It's spring but something's missing

The winter snow has gone. The sun is shining brightly. The seed and flower catalogues have arrived. And, according to the calendar, Spring is just about due.

But as he sits at his typewriter gazing out into the pleasant morning, The Stroller can't help feeling there is something missing.

After a time he couldn't come to realize what it was. Then, when he picked up the daily paper and read the news from the baseball training camps in the south, he realized that he hadn't read anything about the unusual characters, the lads from the coal mining regions of Pennsylvania or the mountainous areas in Arkansas who were splitting the camp on fire.

THERE WAS A time, not too long ago, when the news dispatches from the south carried the word that there was another Babe Ruth or Ty Cobb on the way.

It usually was a case of flowers blooming in the spring trials. But their names and the rise and fall of the emerald one stars made good reading. And they often carried a few real surprises.

During his days when he travelled along the sports trail, The Stroller on occasion to meet several of these young lads who sprouted into camp, stayed a while, provided a lot

of laughs and then were heard no more.

MANY TIMES the joke is on the manager who, listening to the tales of their prowess on the mound or at bat, give them a chance. They work on the theory that there is no telling when a young lad will be a diamond in the rough.

At other times the manager will slip in a fellow as a joke on the writers and enjoy a few laughs as he sees them race for interviews and splash their names on the printed pages.

The Stroller, along with the other news "hounds" was made the victim of one of these managerial plots when Mickey "Black Mike" Cochrane was manager of the Tigers.

It happened the year after the Tigers won the World Series in 1935. As the defending champions, the Tigers were expected to keep the team intact. So, the outlook at spring training camp, presaged a dull six weeks for the writers who had to keep the fans informed.

Then, one morning, a new face appeared in camp. He was a rosy cheeked young lad who gave every appearance of being anxious to get going.

When practice got under way the newcomer walked out to third base. He gave the impression that he was

no stranger to the bag. He stopped everything that came his way. He went to his left, leaped in the air to pull down liners, and caused more than one writer to go "ga ga" over the showing of the rookie.

THE WORD went around that Mary Owen's position was in danger. Mary had starred in the World Series and seemed assured to his job. But when the exhibition season started Mickey sent the newcomer to third base. He stayed there for several games. Then he suddenly came up missing.

"Where's the new guy," the scribes asked Mickey almost in unison.

Mickey led out a loud laugh and answered, "He went back home. He was Charlie Fisher's one of the famed Fisher Brothers' stable boy. He was down here on vacation."

You never saw such red faces as there were along press row and Mickey

never let them forget it. One of these "characters" did make good, however. He was Dizzy Trout, the broad shouldered hurler from Sand Cut, Ind.

When he arrived at camp the first thing he did was tell Mickey in a voice that could be heard across the field, that his worries about the pitching staff were over.

Dizzy had what he called a red bandana pitch. Each time he seemed to be in trouble on the mound, he pulled out the red bandana and let go.

And while Mickey just couldn't believe it, Dizzy didn't allow a hit for the first 12 innings he pitched.

He survived to become one of the Tiger mainstays. But his like seems to be gone forever. The camps now are filled with college kids and the old time walk on "characters" are missing from the training camps. And it is too bad.

As taxpayers and parents, we wish to register several complaints about the present state of Plymouth-Canton Schools. We have talked and grieved with other parents long enough.

Myself, a teacher for 15 years in another district, and my husband, a former high school dropout who has since earned a high school diploma and spent a few years in college, have very different backgrounds, but we both agree on the need for changes in this district.

There is a need for a standard reporting system within the elementary schools. Right now, there are varied report sheets used and even when the same report is used, they are interpreted completely different.

Did you know the reason so many people are against the 45-15 school year is because they feel it means open classrooms. The school board is just adding to this myth by the schools it choose to put on the 45-15 plan.

We, personally, are all for the 45-15 idea, but if it means our children must continue at an open school, we will transfer them to a traditional school year so they may return to a traditional classroom.

THE LAST STUDY we read by open classroom minded people found

that children in the traditional schools were learning better than those in open classes, much to the surprise of the researchers.

At the high school level, I agree with those that say modular scheduling is great, but only for the top 10-20 per cent of students who have proven they are mature and responsible enough to handle it. This was the way modular scheduling was originally set up.

A parent can request that their child be placed on traditional scheduling for only the first two years. Even at that, the student is limited so much in the courses he can take that the parent becomes the heavy.

In fact, the board's interpretation of traditional scheduling is really a distortion. Traditional, in the real sense, means the child should be scheduled into study halls, library and lunch rooms when he is not in class so it is known where this student is at all times of the day.

Also, we demand as parents, that we be notified the first time our child skips a class, not the fourth or the eighth times. We pay the taxes to help run the schools and we have the right

to know if our child is wasting them. Keep your modular scheduling, but make it a privilege for the ones who

next 5-10 years, but more.

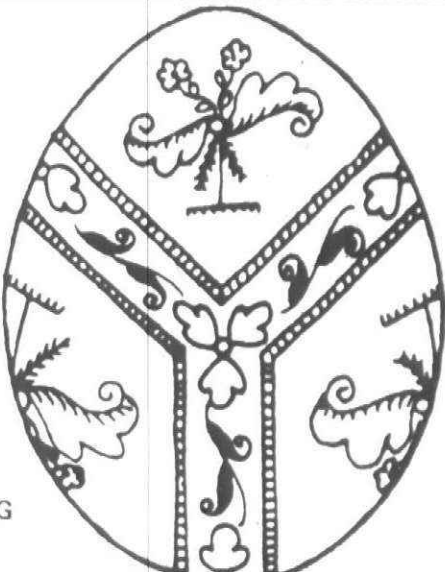
Do we want to end up having closed schools sitting vacant because we overbuilt during our growth spurt? Why waste money and effort?

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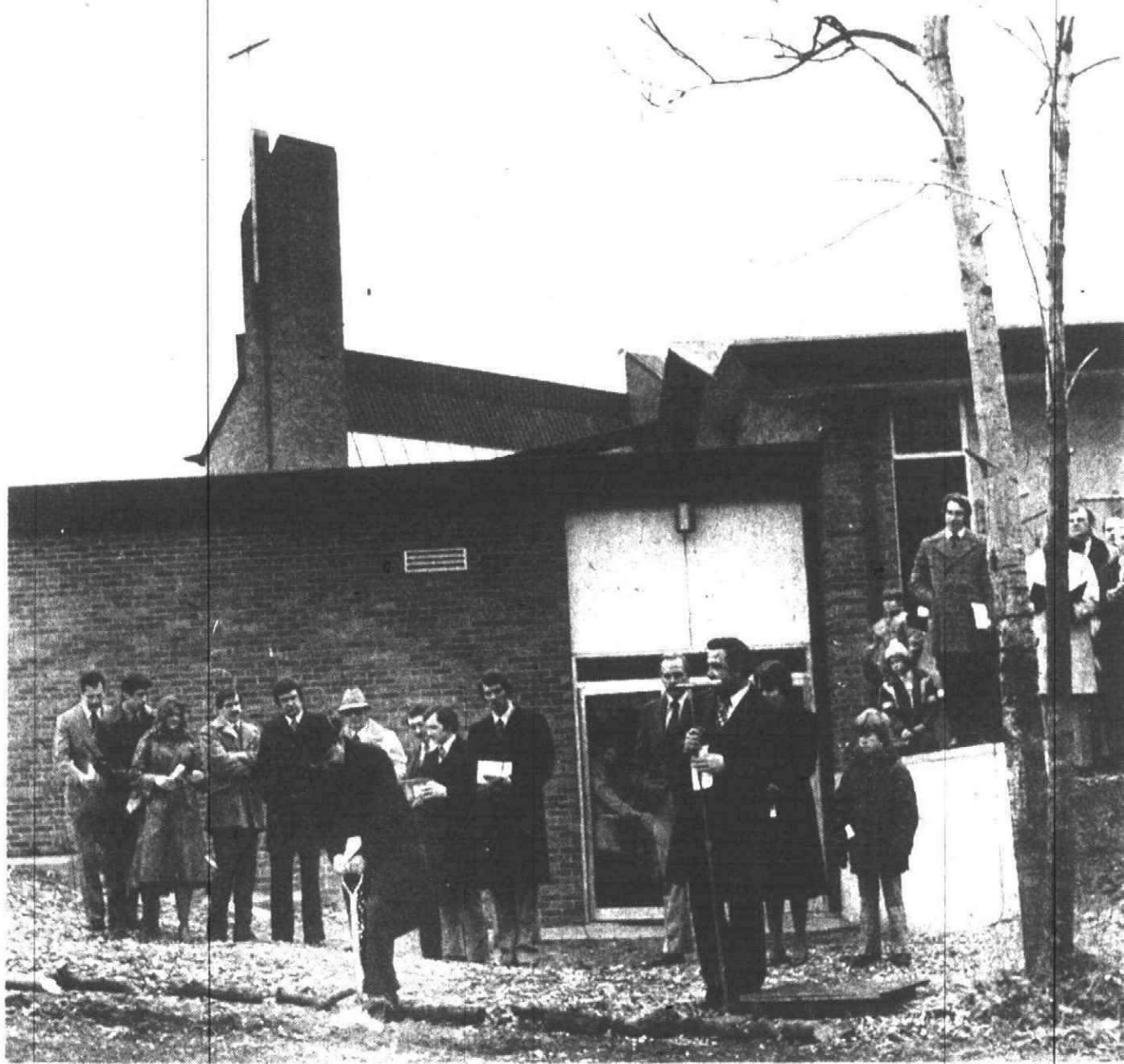
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Ward church begins Phase III building

Ward United Presbyterian Church of Livonia, one of the fastest-growing Presbyterian congregations in the country, has launched the third phase of building on its site at Farmington Road and Six Mile.

Ground was broken Sunday following morning services, for an addition to the large church building to house a youth meeting hall, nine classrooms, a kitchen parlor, storage facilities, a courtyard and a multi-purpose dining hall and gymnasium.

More room is needed, said Dr. Bartlett L. Hess, senior pastor, because the church, now in its 21st year, has greatly expanded activities in all parts of its ministry.

Occupancy of the new quarters is expected early in 1978.

The Livonia congregation, originally a mission of Ward Memorial Presbyterian Church of Detroit, built its first

chapel in 1960, when there were 150 members on its rolls.

By February, 1966, the building of Christian education wings was completed, and the membership numbered 800. The congregation had grown to 1,600 by May 1972, when its larger sanctuary was completed. Its ranks now have been swelled to 2,600.

THREE MORE clergymen and four other full-time staff members now work with Dr. Hess in leading varied phases of the Ward program.

The Rev. L. Edward Davis and the Rev. William C. Moore are associate pastors and the Rev. Robert J. Marlow is minister of visitation. Danford Schar is director of Christian education. Daniel Bower heads ministries for children and the family. Terry Prisk is director of youth ministries and Dr. Jerry Smith is director of music.

All participated in the groundbreaking ceremonies, along with the church's chancel choir.

Also taking part were Lawrence M. Butler, chairman of the Phase III building committee, the Rev. Harry H. Maghakian, associate executive for church development from the Detroit Presbytery, and Frank Pierron, architect from William P. Lindhout & Associates, designers of the building.

Representing various parts of the church ministry were George Currier, clerk of session, Gregory Phelps of the children's department, Marilyn Shaw, women's association president, Harold Kappen, Sunday School superintendent and Tami Zea of the youth department.

WARD CHURCH features many different programs in addition to two Sunday morning services, one broad-

cast weekly over radio WMUZ-FM, and a service each Sunday evening.

There also is Sunday school for all ages, a Wednesday evening school of Christian education, Bible study groups, vacation Bible school and children's rallies.

A Bible quiz team, a Tuesday morning community Bible class, monthly men's prayer breakfasts and 10 women's circles continue the list of church activities.

For younger members there are Pioneer Girls and Boys' Christian Service Brigade and a sports program. Also meeting regularly are singles groups, Keenagers, for persons over 50, leagues for golf, bowling, softball, basketball and volleyball and camera and radio clubs. Summer mission projects and weekend retreats also are regular features of the church program.

"Renewing Love," and 11-week course for women, will be led by Emma Lou Matthews of Redford Township in United Assembly of God Church, 42021 Ann Arbor Trail, Plymouth, Wednesday mornings beginning March 16.

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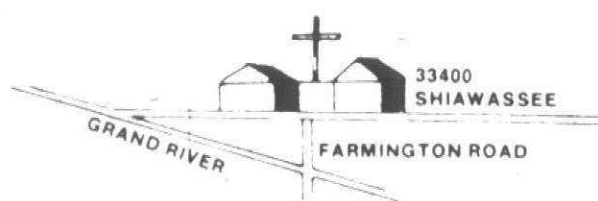

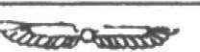

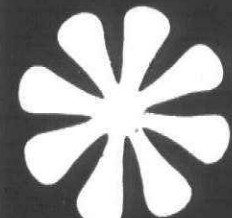

And Henderson collects harps. He has ordered a concert model, the largest harp made, and it will take two or three years to manufacture.

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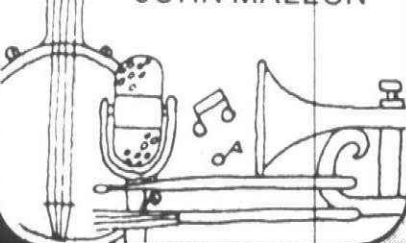
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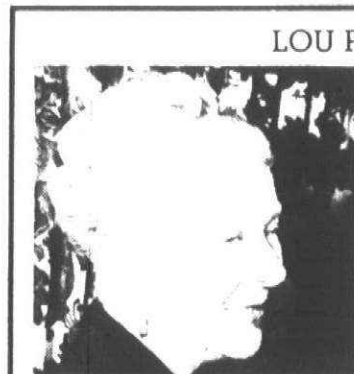
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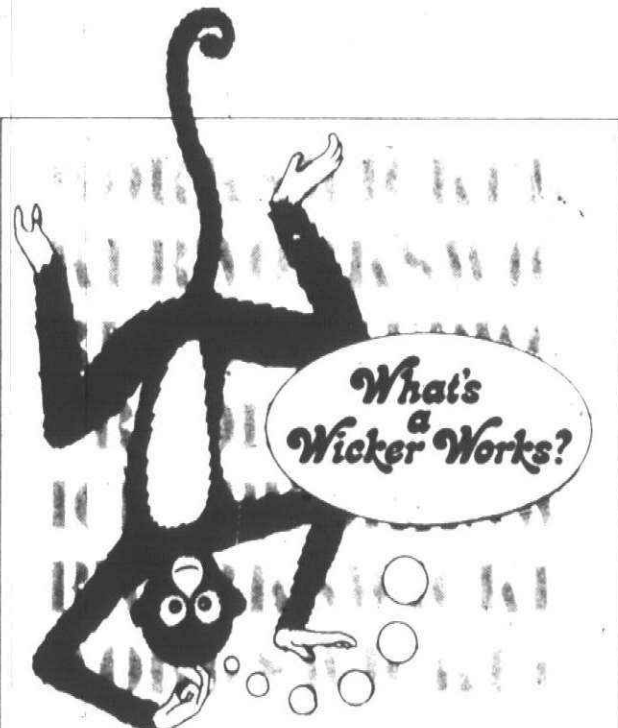
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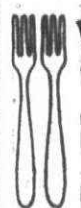
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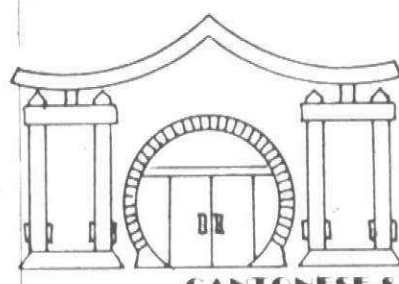

Plymouth Canton was coveting lofty goals when it began the Western Six League swimming meet over the weekend, but the Chiefs had to settle for a third-place finish despite three record-smashing performances.

Northville won the meet to maintain its monopoly on the league swimming title. The Mustangs have won six straight loop crowns.

The unexpected surprise of the meet was Canton's 400-freestyle relay quartet of Dave Tanner, Jamie Greenwood, Steve Wood, and Harris that set a school, league, and pool record and qualified for the state meet with a 3:25.4 time.

Kevin Harris claimed his share of the laurels by winning the 100-free in 49.4, and the 200-free in 1:50. Both wins set new school and pool records and gave Harris two more votes for the Canton High Hall of Fame.

In wrestling Champion, Collins, Leist chosen All-Observerland

The quality of prep wrestling in the area continued to improve this year, as evidenced by the number of grapplers who fought their way through the district and regional rounds of the state tournament and into the finals.

Seventeen matmen from the Observer area advanced to the finals this season, almost twice as many as last year. All 17, therefore, have earned places on the 1976-77 Observer wrestling honor roll.

Dave Champion, senior, Plymouth Salem. The Rocks' co-captain holds all the Salem career and season records for most victories and pins. He compiled a 35-5-2 mark this year. Champion rotated between the 193-pound and heavyweight divisions this season. He placed first in the Suburban Eight League, first at the Plymouth Invitational, second at the Schoolcraft Invitational and third at the regionals.

Champion also was an all-Observer football choice.

Mike Collin, junior, Westland John Glenn. The 141-pound grappler placed first at the Western Wayne Invitational, first at the Northwest Suburban League meet and second at the regionals.

Collin scrapped for an overall record of 18-6 during the campaign. "It was quite a pleasant surprise that he came on so well this year," said Lusk.

Rene Leist, junior, Plymouth Salem. Heir-apparent to Champion in the team leadership department, Leist owns the Salem record for most pins and victories in a season for a junior. He went 30-12-1 this year.

Leist placed third in the Suburban Eight League meet at 122 pounds, then qualified for the state finals at 115. "He's our record holder for juniors," noted Salem coach Ron Krueger.

Scott McKay, senior, Livonia Bentley. The Bulldogs' co-captain worked for a 22-1 individual record during the regular season at 108 pounds.

McKay was first at the Schoolcraft Invitational, first at the Suburban Eight League meet, first at the Thurston Invitational and first at the Livonia Quad. He also placed third at the regionals.

"Scott is an excellent wrestler and the type of wrestler who has developed himself almost to his maximum as far as motor ability and talent are concerned," said Bentley coach Craig Gaal.

Jim Boyer, sophomore, Redford Thurston. Boyer compiled a record of 33-6 and was the one of only two area grapplers to place first at the regionals.

The 101-pound matman also finished first at the Wayne Invitational, the Thurston Invitational and the Northwest Suburban League meet.

He was undefeated in conference duals, placed second at the Plymouth Invitational, third at the Catholic Central Invitational and fifth at the Schoolcraft Invitational.

"The boy did exceptionally well this year," said Thurston coach Jim Urlick. "His attitude toward wrestling is tremendous."

Cage teams have future

The tournament season for Plymouth's two basketball teams lasted only one week as predicted in last week's Observer sports section.

But despite the unfortunate quick departures of Plymouth Canton and Plymouth Salem, one must look on the brighter side of things.

Remember, both these squads were very young this season. Not many people expected a lot of great things to happen this year, and yet, we still enjoyed one league champion and one third place finisher—still in the title chase until the second-to-last week of the season.

And another highlight of the season had to be when both clubs met each other in a close district battle.

This is where both clubs, which are full of talented underclassmen, gained valuable tournament experience that will aid them next year. These players learned how to handle themselves in a pressure-packed situation.

First, let's evaluate Plymouth Salem's season.

There were a lot of people (including myself) who didn't think the Rocks could muster any type of threat for another Suburban Eight League championship.

I thought that if the Rocks finished with an overall mark of 12-8 and no lower than fourth place in the conference, the season could be called a success.

And what happens? The Rocks win their first 11 games of the season enroute to a sparkling 17-5 overall record. Salem breezed to its fourth consecutive league championship and advanced to the district finals before elimination.

The starting seniors that will be lost to next year's Rocks are Bruce Gerish and captain Kevin deBear. The other notable loss will be reserve forward Kevin Roose.

Returning with valuable experience is this year's leading scorer Tom Ellinghausen, sophomore guard Rich Hewlett and defensive stand-out Doug Agnew.

Filling in the places vacated by Gerish and deBear will be Mike Cristie and John Broderick, who both saw plenty of playing time off the bench.

These five experienced players are the core of next year's squad—one that should reap more than its share of successes.

PLYMOUTH CANTON got off to a shaky start at the beginning of the season but showed everyone that it was a team to be reckoned with in the final months of the campaign.

The Chiefs experienced the misfortunes of losing close battles in the first half of the season. But when the new year rolled around, they settled down and won eight of their remaining 13 contests.

The final setback came in the district semifinals, against Salem in a battle that went down to the wire, 55-52, proving clearly that Canton has come of age and that the CEP championship will no longer be a foregone conclusion.

The Chiefs also will lose two members of their starting five to graduation. But aside from these losses, there are some fine players coming through the program.

Rob Mandie and Mike Albright will be missed from the starting lineup next year, and the reserve play of guard Kevin Randazzo will also be gone.

But Randy Rienas, Keith Fuelling, leading scorer Butch King, and reserve Rusty Mandie will be the foundation for what should be a winning season for the Chiefs.

Below these underclassmen are some fine individual players on the junior varsity squad and

Ken Graham, senior, Garden City West. The Tigers' captain finished first at the Wayne Invitational, first at the Tri-River League meet and first at the Garden City Quad in compiling a record of 30-6 at 181 pounds.

Graham also placed third at the Western Wayne Invitational and was undefeated in dual meet competition.

"He had 18 pins and was my outstanding wrestler," said West coach Rick Oster. "Whenever we needed it, he was there with pins. He did a great job for the team."

Scott Collins, junior, Plymouth Canton. The Chiefs' first league champion, the 148-pounder was undefeated

in Western Six League competition. Collins is Canton's first conference champion and first state qualifier.

"He's rewritten the record books for us," said Canton coach Dan Chrenko. Collins holds the season and career records for most victories, most pins and most points.

He finished first at the regionals and reaped a season record of 38-9.

Al Willis, senior, Redford Union. Winner of Redford Union's most valuable wrestler award this season, Willis stamped out a record of 22-13.

The 168-pound grappler, a three-year performer for RU, placed third at the North Farmington Invitational for his best effort outside of dual competition.

"He's a hard worker," said RU coach Martin Covert. "He's inconspicuous, but a conscientious, dedicated kid."

Mark Guadagni, senior, Redford Union. A co-captain and three-year wrestler, Guadagni competed at 148 pounds all season and reaped a 22-10-2 record.

He placed second at the North Farmington Invitational, third at the Thurston Invitational, third at the Suburban Eight League meet and fourth at the regionals.

"He was one of the team leaders—elected captain by the team," said Covert.

Jeff Heidelberg, senior, Clarenceville. A co-captain of the Trojans this year, the 126-pounder grappled to a record of 44-3.

Heidelberg placed first in the Allen Park, Clarenceville, Marine City and South Lyon invitational, first at the Metro West Conference meet, first at the regionals, third at the state finals and fourth at the Schoolcraft College Invitational.

"Jeff is an outstanding mat wrestler," said Clarenceville coach Leo Kinsella. "He has very good balance and wrestles instinctively. He has good potential as a college wrestler."

Matt Prisk, senior, Clarenceville. A co-captain, Prisk also finished first at the Allen Park, Clarenceville, Marine City and South Lyon invitational.

He won at the Metro West Conference meet, placed third at the Schoolcraft Invitational, third at the regionals and fifth at the state finals. His record was 39-4-1 at 193 pounds.

"Matt is extremely strong and determined," said Kinsella. "He is a good team leader and an outstanding individual both on and off the mat."
