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## Teachers turn thumbs down on offer

Following 22 hours of intensive bargaining over the weekend, the school board and teachers union were only a handshake away from agreeing on a contract. But the hands were never extended.

The Plymouth-Canton Board of Education met until past midnight Monday and finally agreed unanimously to authorize an offer of settlement to be made to the Plymouth Education Association (PEA).

At 1 a.m. Tuesday, the board's offer was rejected by the PEA negotiating team which then prepared for a general meeting of its membership late that afternoon in the Penn Theatre.

After an airing of the board's offer, the membership gave the PEA leadership a vote of confidence by confirming rejection of the offer. PEA members also voted to continue the executive committee's authority to call a strike.

UNTIL 1 A.M. Tuesday both sides hoped a contract settlement was near. While the school board was being presented with the results of the weekend bargaining sessions, the PEA negotiating team was waiting in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High School. The PEA hoped the concessions hammered out Saturday and Sunday would result in a contract settlement.

School trustees were in the conference room at the back of the principal's office in Canton High School getting a briefing of the weekend marathon bargaining from its chief negotiator, Norm Kee.

The board authorized a higher economic offer if the PEA would agree to five other provisions in the contract.

The school board, feeling its five requests were reasonable, also hoped for a settlement once its total offer was presented to the PEA team.

The school board adjourned its session with Kee about 12:45 a.m. Tuesday, and the PEA team was invited into the conference room. Kee talked with them for about five minutes, and then left them alone for a caucus. Kee met with them again for about three minutes, and then the PEA team filed out announcing that the offer had been rejected because it was unacceptable.

THE HOPES FOR A settlement

were first generated March 1 when Kee laid on the table a tentative offer to increase the money package by three per cent.

The school board's economic offer had amounted to a total improvement of 30 per cent over three years—or about 10 per cent a year. That 30 per

cent included salary increases, increment hikes now in the contract, cost-of-living allowances and contribution to the teachers' pension fund. Kee's March 15 offer increased the total dollar improvement from 30 to 33 per cent. The PEA tentatively accepted the economic offer. Both parties signed a tentative agreement that night.

The next day Kee said the economic offer was dependent on us negotiating the entire contract," says Gerald McKinley, chief negotiator for the PEA. "But we do have a tentative

## True ZBA will be decided by judge

Canton's "true" Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) will be chosen by Wayne County Circuit Judge Neal Fitzgerald, if the court agrees to render a declaratory judgment deciding which of the two disputed zoning boards has legal sanction.

Harold Stein, Canton Township supervisor, instigated the court action Monday and announced that he is paying the attorney's fee out of his own pocket, not the township's.

"There is some question as to whether the rest of the township board would support spending public money to decide which five people should le-

gally sit on the ZBA," Stein said. "To avoid all the criticism I know we'd get about playing politics with taxpayer's money. I figured the easiest way to resolve the issue would be to pick up the tab myself."

Canton's attorney, William Sempliner, is attorney for plaintiffs Stein and Gary Sands, chairman of the most recently-appointed ZBA. Four of Sands' fellow board members are listed as defendants in the case along with Jim Donahue and the other four members of the "defunct" ZBA that Sempliner believes was appointed illegally.

Stein said he hopes Judge Fitzgerald will resolve the controversy before March 30, the date of the next scheduled ZBA meeting. Chairmen of both questionable ZBAs have reserved meetings but both have been advised to postpone sessions until the court makes a decision.

The first order of business for the "true" ZBA will be to consider granting the Canton Township a zoning variance that would allow officials to break ground on a three-story township hall. The present zoning law limits buildings to two stories.

THE ZBA CONTROVERSY stems from the former administration's action of September 28, when five persons were appointed to the ZBA as required by 1976 state law. Former supervisor Robert Greenstein appointed himself, Jim Donahue, Robert Miller, John Burdick and Tom Quinn to the ZBA despite howls of "cronyism" from Trustee Brian Schwall.

After the new township administration took office in November, the township's counsel, Sempliner, issued an opinion that the ZBA headed by Donahue was illegal because Canton never amended its zoning ordinance

to comply with the state mandate requiring at least five people on a ZBA in a township of 5,000 or more residents. Though five were originally appointed, Canton's local zoning ordinance still called for a three-member ZBA.

So, on Jan. 25, the Canton board changed its local ordinance to call for a five-member board. On Feb. 8 the board appointed five new people to replace the "nullified" ZBA headed by Greenstein. Members of the second, or most recent, ZBA are Chairman Gary Sands, Robert Padgett, Trustee Gene Daley, Kathy Prince, and William Gilmore. All were approved at Stein's recommendation by a 6-1 vote. Trustee Robert Myers was in the minority.

DONAHUE AND fellow members of the "nullified" first ZBA didn't take their ouster lying down. Donahue secured legal opinions on the controversy from a Michigan Townships Association counsel and Atty. General Frank Kelley. Both attorneys disagreed with Sempliner and said members of the defunct ZBA were legally appointed.

Contacted Tuesday, Donahue was surprised that Stein requested a declaratory judgment.

"This is news to me," he said. "I'll have to consult with the others (on the defunct ZBA) to see if we should get an attorney to represent us."

Donahue said Sempliner may be courting with a conflict-of-interest by representing Stein and Sands with township documents when "private citizen Stein" is being represented.

Two weeks ago Donahue alleged that Stein told Sempliner "the legal opinion he wanted and asked Sempliner to make it legal."

Sempliner said he called the case "the way I saw it," and wouldn't "be put in the middle of a political fight."

Sempliner said there are no grounds for conflict-of-interest charges.

"I'm representing the supervisor of the township and the chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals in their official capacities," Sempliner said.

A SPEEDY RESOLUTION in the ZBA dispute is necessary, Stein said, to "clear the air of the cloud that exists over the ZBA status. Time is of the essence." Stein said, before quoting a "crucial section" of the legal request for declaratory judgment:

"The controversy raises a serious public question in that the actions of either (ZBA) may be challenged, and the public cannot know whether the decision of either board is a valid decision or not."

"It is necessary to have the controversy resolved quickly so the board of zoning appeals may resume its functions, and its powers exercised in the public interest."

## Deer Creek tough on rowdy tenants

Managers of Canton's Deer Creek Park Apartments are launching an all-out campaign to rid the complex of "troublemakers" who gave a reputation of vandalism and rowdiness to the apartments on Joy near I-275.

Standard Realty of Southland, the firm that purchased three of Deer Creek's four phases last January, is attempting to evict residents caught breaking the law or otherwise disturbing the peace on the apartments' grounds.

"I want to get the troublemakers out," said new resident manager Nancy Cusick. "We're going to tell them, 'If you can't abide by our rules for family living, then we just don't want you here.' Either they clean up their act, or they get out."

ACCORDING TO Miss Cusick, vandalism has been "rampant" at Deer Creek during the last few years. Residents vandalized other tenants' apartments and cars, and committed malicious pranks, such as throwing shampoo into Deer Creek's pool and gluing mailboxes shut.

Others have broken Deer Creek's rules and disturbed neighbors around them by cooping up large barking dogs or throwing frequent rowdy parties.

According to Miss Cusick, some units at Deer Creek house two or more families in violation of the complex's rules.

A clause in residents' lease agreements says tenants may be evicted if they break the law or the apartments' rules.

Standard Realty plans to take advantage of the eviction clause.

"But I don't want to take any action," Miss Cusick explained, "before I have everything documented."

From now on, anyone caught destroying property or committing a malicious prank will be "written up" by the apartments' security force and turned over to the Wayne County Sher-

iff's Department if the action was illegal.

Management will then serve a 30-day eviction notice to residents caught in a vandalizing act. Finally, eviction proceedings—a process that normally takes four to six weeks—will begin in Plymouth's 35th District Court.

Miss Cusick says management will follow a similar procedure to evict residents accused of disturbing the peace by housing large dogs or throwing rowdy parties. In those cases, however, management will give residents an opportunity to "clean up their act" during the 30-day warning period.

THE EVICTION PROGRAM, Miss Cusick hopes, will help Deer Creek

live down its bad reputation.

"I feel very enthusiastic about Deer Creek," she said. "I want Deer Creek to be a place that Plymouth and Canton can be proud of."

"I think what we have here is a batch of 'bad eggs' and a few teenage followers," she maintained. "If we get rid of the bad eggs, the teens will have no one to follow."

Plans to implement a recreational program for children and adults in the not too distant future should keep Deer Creek's younger residents out of trouble, Miss Cusick added.

The resident manager believes Standard Realty has already begun to tackle some of Deer Creek's problems by evicting residents who are delinquent on their rental payments. Those residents, she says, are often

the ones who vandalize property or disturb their neighbors.

"I think what happened is that the previous management let people get extremely delinquent," Miss Cusick said.

The replacement of the former management's "rent-a-cop" security force with "in-house" security, hired directly by Standard Realty to patrol Deer Creek, should also help solve the apartment complex's problems, Miss Cusick believes. The "in-house" force reacts more readily to management's directives.

"Most of the 'good' residents are behind us 100 per cent," Miss Cusick said. "The management and most of the residents want a nice family community for Deer Creek."

## Donahue and LaBell now say Stein recall talk is premature

Purported leaders of an alleged campaign to recall Canton Supervisor Harold Stein say they have no plans to spearhead a recall drive—at least not now.

"It's just not true," said Jim Donahue of published reports that he and Canton resident Linda LaBell are spearheading a recall drive.

"But I will be in the middle of a recall campaign if one ever comes up. I think Stein has taken the township to the cleaners."

Donahue, former co-chairman of the Committee to Re-elect the Greenstein Team, and Mrs. LaBell, a member and critic of the township's land use study committee, were identified in a recent edition of the Canton Eagle as leaders of a recall-Stein campaign. Donahue was quoted as saying that recall petitions "will be circulated."

BOTH TOLD the Observer this week that they were misquoted in the Eagle story. Donahue said recall petitions have not even been printed.

"My statement was that sometime in the future, if the situation warrants it, petitions will be circulated," Donahue said. "I was explicit that nothing has been done at this time."

According to Mrs. LaBell, a part-time employee of the Canton Eagle asked for her feelings toward a possible recall drive.

"I said I would have to weigh my feelings about a recall if it came up," she said.

"What I stated to the reporter was that I can't see how Mr. Stein can serve the people without listening to them. My concern lies with the welfare of the community. I have doubts that Mr. Stein's direction is the same

as that of the whole township."

Although Donahue believes grounds for a recall campaign now exist, he does not believe the majority of Canton residents would support a recall-Stein campaign.

"He's doing little piddly things that the average person doesn't pay attention to," Donahue said of Stein. "The average person doesn't care about the controversy over the ZBA (zoning board of appeals) or that Stein appointed a new police chief."

Stein did not appear worried by recall threats.

"I believe I'm doing everything in the best interests of Canton," the supervisor said. "If they want to push it, let's get on with the recall effort. I'll probably accomplish a few more good things by the time it comes up."

## Auto sales here follow profit levels

If coming events cast their shadows before them, the automobile dealers in the Plymouth community are headed for their biggest year.

On the heels of announcements of record profits by the Big Three, the area dealers confide that it is no longer a question of selling cars but one of getting shipments from the factories.

Both Jack Selle, the Buick dealer, and Leo Calhoun, the Ford dealer on Plymouth Road, don't hesitate to tell that they can sell the cars as fast as they can get them—but getting them is another problem.

Selle confides that the month of January and the extreme cold cut into his sales, but toward the end of the month and thus far in February business has been better than expected.

It was the same with Lou LaRiche, the Chevrolet dealer on Plymouth Road. "One of the big things that is helping is General Motors plan to grant extra incentives to retired employees by increasing the rebate to \$200 and \$300.

"After a rather poor January, business picked up with the start of February and is steadily increasing."

Like the other dealers he admits having trouble in getting cars because of the demand for the larger models before GM may change to a smaller type. "Our top models now have been given the Vic Tanny treatment in that they are thinner and have lost some weight. "Our Caprice and the Monte Carlo are taking the eye of the public even though they are in the \$5,000 to \$7,000 bracket.

"As to the smaller cars, like other dealers we are having trouble even though the GM rebate is supposed to end Feb. 28."

THE MOST exuberant dealer in the area is Dominic Marino at the Colony Chrysler dealership at Ann Arbor Road and Lilley.

"We are just going great," he said

with a broad grin. "In fact business is so good that we are planning a second-story expansion over the showroom. The architects are drawing plans now and we will have a real showroom (all glass) by the end of the summer." Marino said the business spurt has been helped along by his winning bid to sell 1,200 cars to the state. "We've been here 10 years, and this is the best we ever have done. I now have a goal of 2,400 cars for the year—and that is not a wild guess."

"We weren't caught in a slump during the cold spell," Jack Clayton, vice-president and sales manager at Don Massey Cadillac, insisted.

"Our sales right now are excellent and we expect to go up about 119 per cent over last year and 1976 was a banner year."

ANOTHER DEALER looking at the pot of gold at the end of the rainbow, was Jim Seavitt, who handles the sales at Hines Park Mercury.

"Like the others, we are having trouble getting cars. If we can get them, I expect that our business will be up about 50 per cent and may go to 75 per cent or even higher."

While most of the dealers are bemoaning the fact that the cars are almost a drug on the market, such is not the case with Clarence DuCharme at the American Motors dealership on Ann Arbor Road.

With a broad grin he makes no pretense at hiding his optimism by saying that "we are moving away above our anticipation."

"Business was slow toward the end of last year, but it is booming now and this should be a great year."

So, boiled down to its essentials, the majority of dealers have two problems—getting new big cars and selling the small compact models put out by the Big Three for the past few years.

As one dealer phrased it, "we may have to eat them."

## Kirk to debate school financing

Russell Kirk, well-known author, columnist and native of Plymouth, will debate public school financing in Michigan April 1 at Alma College.

Kirk will debate against Dr. Wilbur J. Cohen, head of the school of education at University of Michigan.

The debate topic is: "Resolved, that a new system of financing public education in Michigan should be adopted which would include a greater degree of state and federal participation." Cohen will present the affirmative with Kirk presenting the negative view.

Reacting to the debate, which will begin at 1:30 p.m. April 1 in Down Auditorium on the Alma campus, will be a panel of educators and state government officials, including James Phelps, special assistant for education to Gov. Milliken. The program is open to the public without charge.

Kirk, a native of Plymouth, speaks and writes on a wide range of topics

including political practice and educational theory. He has debated such notables as William Buckley, Jr., Arthur Eugene McCarthy, Clark Kerr, Saul Alinsky and Malcolm X. He has authored 18 books and several hundred essays, short stories and essay-reviews. He writes a monthly page on education in the National Review and a syndicated column, "To the Point," in more than 200 daily newspapers.

Cohen has devoted his professional career as a teacher, administrator and policy-maker. He was secretary of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW) in 1968, assistant secretary for legislation at HEW in 1961, and HEW undersecretary from 1965-68.

Cohen had come to Washington in 1934 as research assistant to the executive director of President Roosevelt's cabinet committee which drafted the original Social Security Act.



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# More '45-15' predicted if bond vote fails

Year-round school is certain to expand next year but will be extended to more buildings if the April 23 bond issue fails.

That was one of the recurring responses from the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education Monday night during a question-answer session on the bond issue and millage renewal ballot proposals.

About 250 persons, many of them teachers, jammed the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High for the two-hour public workshop on the election issues.

The workshop began after a short meeting at 7 p.m. which resulted in the school board voting 6-0 to approve the language of the proposal to appear on the ballot Saturday, April 23.

SUPT. JOHN M. HOBEN began the workshop by noting that the school district expects 1,400 to 1,500 additional students next fall and the projections beyond this year "are even more frightening."

As an example of the growth crush, he cited the Hulsing Elementary attendance area in Canton. Hulsing opened this year with a capacity for 660 students and now has 770 attending.

"Our projections show the student enrollment from the Hulsing area will climb to 1,600 within a year or two."

Another example of fast growth cited by Hoben was the Sunflower subdivision south of the Centennial Educational Park. "There are 1,700 new homes being built in Sunflower and that's the same number of homes which are now in the entire City of Plymouth."

"Our projections indicate there are 5,000 new homes to be opened within five years, and that equates to about 5,000 additional students we have to find classroom space for. We are favoring an enrollment which will climb to 19,000 by 1981."

Hoben stressed that the new construction proposed in the bond issue by itself won't accommodate the future growth. "We still must use alternatives, such as greater use of Extended School Year (ESY) or portable buildings, along with new construction to keep pace with the growth. By using these alternatives, though, we

hope to avoid overbuilding.

"The growth is expected to peak at about 19-21,000 and then decline. We hope to use alternatives to absorb the growth up to its peak so we aren't stuck with school buildings which cannot be used at the decline stage."

Four years ago voters defeated a proposed \$25 million bond issue for five years, and voted down a second proposal of \$17 million for three years. Finally, in 1974, a \$10 million proposal for two years was approved. "Those two years are up and we are now directly faced with the growth we anticipated four years ago," Hoben added.

SMITH HORTON, a resident who chairs the school district's population projections committee, supported Hoben's projections as being accurate.

"Our committee sees the same type of population growth as the superintendent. It's coming just as he describes it."

Horton commented that in its research his committee found that colonial homes tend to generate more

school-age children than ranches. Another finding was that as the value of a home rises, there tends to be more school age children living there, until the \$60,000 mark is reached and then it drops off.

"In projecting student populations, then, it is important to consider many variables including type of home and the market values of homes," he said.

YEAR-ROUND SCHOOL questions from the audience evoked these responses:

- Students on year-round schedules get six weeks more schooling during the year and tend to absorb more because less time has to be spent on review after a break.

- The administration remains unconvinced that year-round school can be implemented at the high school level. The option to absorb growth at the high school seems, instead, to be split sessions from about 7-12 and 12-5.

- Year-round scheduling may handle

growth for two years if expanded to 12 schools, but without new construction the district will be unable to absorb the growth after 1978-79 by ESY alone.

- The traditional calendar provides for 12 weeks vacation during one year. Under ESY some six weeks vacation time will fall at the same time that students on traditional schedules will be out.

- It will cost about \$50,000 in operating funds for each building that goes on the ESY schedule. That cost is being assumed by the school district to hold down construction costs to a minimum to avoid overbuilding.

- The school district cannot afford to put all buildings on ESY next year because of the operating cost. If the district could afford to, though, ESY at all schools wouldn't be sufficient to meet the growth expected to peak at 21,000 students.

OTHER QUESTIONS from the audience generated the following information:

- Nearby school districts with declining enrollment and buildings being closed don't offer viable options to Plymouth-Canton. Whitman Junior High won't be closed in Livonia for two years and the nearest district with buildings now available is Garden City—18 miles away.

- After 1977, busing students between buildings within the district won't be available as an option to absorb.

- It will take two years before new buildings are available for use, if the bond issue is approved, and in two years there would be three new elementary and two new middle schools. Two other elementarys would open four years from now.

- One of the new elementarys would be in Section 22 of Canton and the other near Sunflower subdivision. The third could be either near Erikson Elementary, in Plymouth Township near McClumpha Road, or east of Miller Elementary on the east side

of Morton Taylor. Location of the third school would depend on concentration of growth in particular areas.

- On the need for the operating renewal, it was noted the district is facing inflationary costs of eight per cent a year. Blue Cross is going up 34 per cent April 1 and will hit the \$1 million mark for the first time, as will utility costs. Utility and medical insurance combined will account for one-tenth of the operating budget next year.

- The increase in SEV in the city and townships won't generate additional operating money for the school district because state aid is cut as local income rises—much like a teeter-totter.

- Of the \$29.7 million in the bond issue, about \$23 million would be spent on new buildings, \$6 million on renovation and fees for architects, engineers and other professionals.

- For every year the school district delays building new schools, construction costs will rise by six to eight per cent. If the district waits a couple of years, it will cost \$40 million to do the same projects that now will cost almost \$30 million. The district hopes to buy now and pay off with inflated dollars.

- If the five-mill renewal fails, the

district will have to cut programs, supplies and equipment to the amount of \$2½ million. The board has received a recommendation to close Tanger and Starkweather schools and put all other schools on split session if the renewal fails, with class loads increased from 27 to 35 pupils per teacher.

- Portable classroom units cost \$14,000 to \$16,000 apiece to erect. It would take six portables to house 180 students at a cost exceeding \$80,000. ESY can expand capacity of one building by 230 students without capitol outlay. The district, thus, needs money from the bond issue to use portable classrooms as an option.

- The former Wayne County Child Development Center at Five Mile and Sheldon isn't a viable option for the school. Most of the buildings are cottages unsuitable for classroom use. One larger building could be used as a high school, but the costs to bring the structure up to code for school use are prohibitive, an expense which includes installation of a complete elevator system.

- The parochial schools planned in the Plymouth-Canton community won't be sufficient to absorb any significant portion of the growth, primarily because most of the private enrollment will come from out of the district.

## Summary on bond proposal

There will be two proposals on the ballot for the special election Saturday, April 23, of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The millage proposal seeks approval for the renewal of five mills (\$5 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation). The levy, presently being collected, represents about \$100 of the current school taxes now paid by the owner of a \$40,000 house.

The bond proposal seeks permission from voters to borrow \$29.7 million over a five-year period for new construction and renovation of existing school buildings. Under the proposal, the school district would borrow \$19.7 million now. That immediate loan would require the equivalent of one mill for five years to pay off, or \$20 a year for the owner of a \$40,000 house. Two years from now the district would seek state approval to borrow \$10 million which, if granted, would add one-half mill to the debt retirement levy.

The \$19.7 million loan would be used for construction of three elementarys and one middle school, plus renovation projects. The \$10 million would be for two elementarys and one middle school.

To meet projected growth between now and 1981, the school district plans to implement expanded 45-15 year-round scheduling to supplement the increased student capacity from the seven new buildings. Under Extended School Year (ESY), students attend school for nine weeks (45 school days) and are off for three weeks (15 days).

The elementary schools are expected to cost about \$2 million each and the middle schools \$5½ million each. All seven buildings would increase student capacity by 5,528 which would handle growth until it reaches about 20,000 in 1981. The student enrollment is expected to peak at 21,000 after 1981.

## Testing of fire fighters rapped

Six firefighters and three cadets were hired by the township board Tuesday following an argument about civil service testing procedures.

Trustees Brian Schwall and Robert Myers squared off in a heated argument which started when Myers explained that all applicants were given a percentile grade on their oral interviews with members of the civil service commission.

"You rated applicants' intelligence through oral interviews," Schwall said. "How can one give an objective percentile rating on how you feel about someone?"

Schwall said there is no place on a supposedly objective test for hiring to let interviewers rank people on the basis of "feelings and impressions."

Myers said he thought it odd that Schwall criticized civil service procedure when "you've never once attended one of our meetings, which are open as opposed to your police commission."

Schwall is a member of the police commission, while Myers sits on the Canton Civil Service Commission that exists in Canton even though it was never legally instituted.

The motion to hire the six firefighters and three cadets was passed

by a 4-3 vote before most of the criticism was aired. After hearing that applicants were given a percentile grade on an oral interview, in addition to a written intelligence test, Treasurer Anne Bradley tried to call for a second vote to cancel the hirings.

Her motion died for lack of support among the other three people who originally voted to hire the nine men. To cancel the first vote, her motion would have had to have been supported by Myers, or trustees Lynne Goldsmith or Gene Daley who voted to hire the men recommended by the civil service board.

## Twp. postpones court date

## Windsor parkers fight apts.

Even though the Canton Township board shot down site plans for an apartment complex on the northwest corner of Morton Taylor and Warren, the township's own attorney feels the developer has a stronger case than the township.

Bert Burgoyne, attorney for Canton, advised the board that he saw little chance for victory in the lawsuit filed by Slavik Development Co. against

Canton for its Nov. 9 vote which rejected site plans for a 153-unit apartment complex called Windsor Woods. But if the township demands it, Burgoyne said he'll fight the apartments in court.

A decision on the lawsuit was postponed Tuesday night to allow the attorney for the Windsor Park homeowners to meet with Burgoyne to argue the merits of the fighting the

case against Slavik in court.

Supervisor Harold Stein said it is his hope to "avoid unnecessary litigation" but that the homeowners could intervene in the lawsuit between the township and the developer.

"Does that mean the township will vigorously defend our interests?" William Botwick asked the board. "He was told that residents would have input in the negotiations."

"What is going to happen?" Botwick asked. "Will there be two plaintiffs in court and one intervener?"

"I'm concerned about the future effects if the township gets a reputation of folding every time someone sues them or challenges them in court."

Botwick argues that the Canton board of trustees was on sound legal footing Nov. 9 when it nullified previously approved site plans for Slavik's planned unit development (PUD).

The original developer secured a PUD agreement with the township in 1969 which called for construction of 55 condominiums and 98 apartments. In 1972 the PUD was amended to allow the builders to build 90 condominiums and no apartments.

After four condominiums were built, Slavik went back to the township board in 1974 to explain that the market had collapsed on condominium sales and asked that the PUD be amended to allow 153 apartments on the site.

Botwick claims that although the Canton administration, under Supervisor Phil Dingeldey, may have made an oral agreement to allow Slavik the right to build 153 apartments, the amendment was never put in writing and is therefore meaningless.

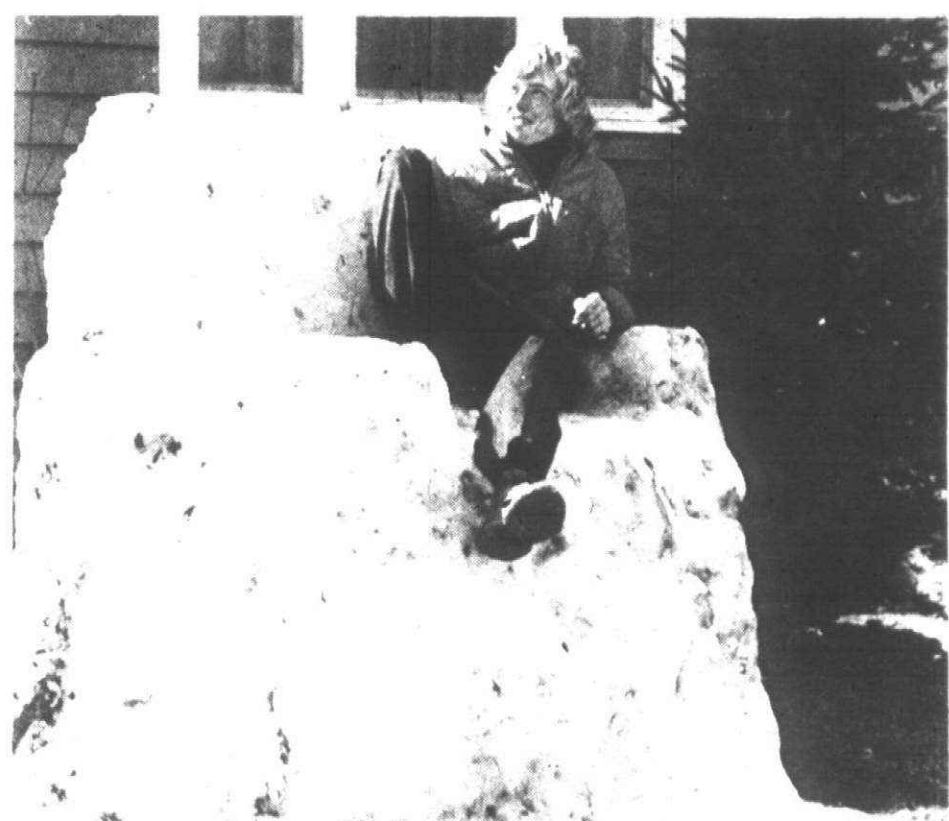
"Then, as of Oct. 15, 1975, the PUD agreement as amended does not include the right to construct apartments," Botwick said, "pursuant to Windsor Woods' plan."

Members of the Windsor Woods Homeowner Association said they supported Botwick's stand.

In Slavik's lawsuit, the company's lawyer, Norman Hyman, said Canton "has no right to unilaterally rescind or amend the agreement."

"The site plan is in conformity with the agreement," Hyman said, "and the defendants are bound by it."

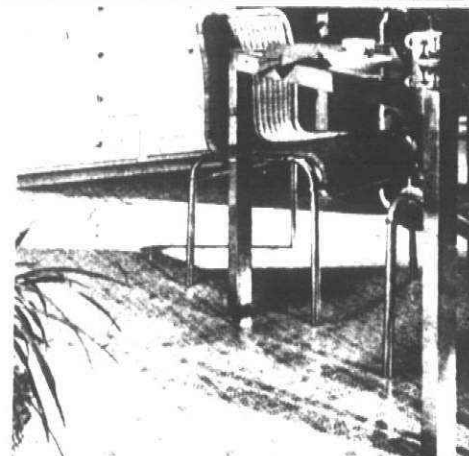

# Youths join project

## Protecting elderly from theft

The City of Plymouth's senior citizen coordinator, the police department and a social studies class at Centennial Educational Park have combined to offer a personal property identification service to community senior citizens.

The new program, which starts this week, enables seniors to make an appointment for students to come to their homes and mark easily stolen articles with an identifying number.

"This approach has been successful in cutting down thefts in areas of the country where it has been tried," said Terry Carroll, senior citizen coordinator. "And I think once it gets going here it will do some good."

Although marking property won't prevent theft, the numbers make it easy for police to give recovered stolen property back to the lawful owners.

The police department is providing students with the engraving tools and Sgt. Joe Kahanek, community service officer, met with the students to give them tips on what kind of household articles burglars most often take.

"Primarily the kids will be marking TVs, radios, cameras and small valu-

able items which are easily taken and have a good resale value," Carroll said.

AFTER A SENIOR citizen calls to schedule an appointment, he will be given the name of the student who will be sent to the home. When the student arrives, he will present an identification card so the senior knows it is the same person.

The student will then mark the property with either the owner's driver's license or social security number. A de-

scription of the item and the number will be recorded on a log sheet and given to the police department. Before the student leaves, he will give the owner a sticker to put in the window, notifying potential burglars that the property in the house is registered with the police.

"According to the information we have," Carroll said, "if a burglar knows the valuables are on record and easily traced, he will not want to run the risks involved."

The students, part of Bob Thoms' community service class, receive

school credit for volunteering their time and effort to the community.

"Right now there are nine kids who will be doing the marking," Thoms said, "but I think more will get involved as the service gets going."

"I really have a good feeling about the possibilities for this idea. There seems to be a natural chemistry between teen-agers and senior citizens, and I think the contact will do both of them good."

## Debate at Schoolcraft

## Classroom safe from guns?

A gunshot more than a month ago triggered serious debate among Schoolcraft College trustees last week about guns on campus.

At question was the sanctity of the classroom, and the college's right to

ban concealed weapons on its grounds and in its buildings.

The incident which precipitated the discussion occurred in mid-February when a student, who also happened to be an off-duty Livonia policeman, accidentally caused his gun to misfire during a class.

The room was dark, and as the students watched a film, the officer turned in his seat, causing his gun to discharge.

The bullet ricocheted, hit the officer in the buttock, and then lodged in the wall.

No one else was hurt.

"THIS WARRANTS action," said trustee Mark McQuesten. "But the question is what course is best for us to take. I think the whole issue is in need of serious discussion."

E.F. Petersen, manager of business services for the college was charged with investigating the incident. He said the matter is complicated by the fact that Michigan law allows officers to carry concealed weapons and that the state police, Wayne County Sheriff, Farmington, Garden City, Livonia and Northville Township all require their officers to be armed off-duty.

The cities of Northville and Plymouth leave the option up the individual officer.

Petersen added that the gun was not holstered at the time of the incident—against department policy—and that the offending officer was disciplined by superiors.

WHILE SOME trustees suggested the incident was a freak, McQuesten, who as a Schoolcraft student fought to have guns restricted on campus, pushed for a solution to the problem.

"Accidents are not usually preventable—but in this case we can. The officer or anyone else in the classroom might have been killed."

"Even our security officers don't carry guns. The college's attitude is consistent in one respect and inconsistent in another."

"We have to give this serious consideration," he said.

Trustee Rosina Raymond echoed McQuesten's sentiments. "This disturbs me. It sounds pretty bad to have armed people in a classroom. It's ludicrous; almost unethical."

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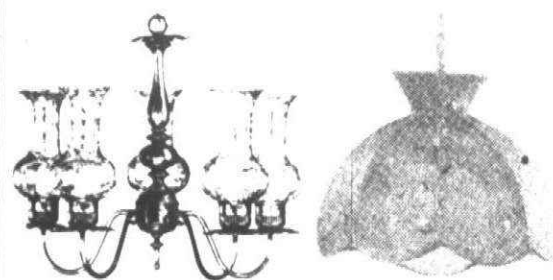
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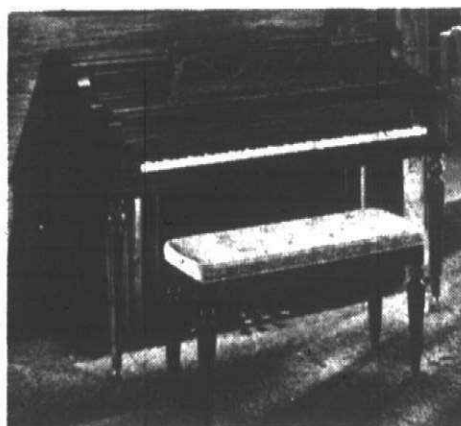
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# Insurance, 45-15 snags pact

agreement on the salary package—both parties signed at the table. The PEA is quite aware that total agreement must be reached before we have negotiated a master agreement.

All last week both sides remained in suspense over whether a settlement was imminent. Kee maintained the economic offer was only good if the PEA agreed to give up something in return, while the PEA maintained tentative agreement had been reached on economics and it was up to the board to accept that tentative agreement.

The PEA bargaining team felt the school board had rejected the economic offer signed by Kee, Supt. John M. Hoben says, though, that the school board last week never took a vote on the economic offer.

**MONDAY NIGHT** trustees gave Kee permission to make a total and hopefully final offer.

That offer did include a three per cent economic offer but the board insisted that to get the three per cent the PEA must agree to five stipulations in the contract.

One of the five provisions was contract language on extended school year (ESY). The PEA had indicated it would agree to extension of ESY to 12 buildings during the next three years, but any extension of ESY beyond that must be mutually agreed upon between the board and PEA.

The board wanted to raise the number to allow extension of ESY to 16

schools in three years, and wanted to eliminate the phrase that expansion of ESY was a negotiable item. The board argues it is management's right to implement ESY as it is an educational program, and that management shouldn't forfeit its right to administer in a labor contract.

The PEA, however, sees ESY as a drastic change in the school year and argues it must be negotiated because the calendar is a negotiable item.

"The right to negotiate ESY is in the master agreement that expired this year," says McKinley, "and I'm not ready to give away something as important as the right to negotiate the calendar."

**ANOTHER STIPULATION** wanted by the board was an agreement to "cap" payment of medical insurance premiums.

Under the board's proposal, if medical premiums exceeded \$100 per teacher in the third year of the contract, the school board and individual teacher would share half of the increase over \$100. (If medical premiums reached \$110 per month in the third year, the school district would pay \$5 and the teacher \$5 a month. The teacher's contribution would be deducted from his cost-of-living allowance).

The board hoped the PEA would agree to the cap because it would mean a very low cost, if any, to individual teachers for the three years of the contract. The board wants to tie escalating medical premiums to cost-

of-living payments because insurance rates are inflationary.

"It might be true that the medical insurance cap won't cost teachers anything for three years," reacted Candi Reece, PEA president. "But that's not justification for accepting a cap. Once the board gets a cap in the contract, it will remain in all future contracts. We aren't going to create that kind of a problem for future bargaining teams."

"The PEA is willing to continue working with the administration on reducing medical insurance costs. I understand it's spiraling and getting out of hand. But we cannot accept a cap."

Another condition of the board was that the PEA agree to abide by all the tentative agreements worked out over the weekend.

**THE BOARD ALSO** wanted further reductions in stipends paid to teachers for special services performed.

Last year's contract contained schedule D, which provided for stipends to be paid to certain specialists such as psychologists, social workers, middle school representatives, counselors, and type A crisis room teachers.

The board's offer is to eliminate stipends for all but the middle school representatives. The board's offer provides that all teachers now receiving stipends would be grandfathered and continue to receive the payment.

New hires, though, wouldn't receive the stipend. The elimination of the

stipend was to take effect in the third year of the new contract. The board estimates it could save \$60,000 over three years by elimination of schedule D.

**THE FIFTH** board request is to eliminate a clause defining the school board's liability in case of a lawsuit on the PEA's agency shop rule.

By agency shop agreements, teachers must pay union dues to the PEA as a condition of employment. If dues aren't paid, the school board, by master agreement, is supposed to dismiss the teacher.

The clause in the contract which the board objects to that the PEA won't participate in the defense of any lawsuit a teacher might bring for dismissal under the provision. The clause places all liability and defense actions on the school board.

**THE REJECTION** by the PEA of the board's five proposals means a settlement is no longer close, although technically the table position remains the same as it did following the 22 hours of bargaining over the weekend.

The board's higher salary package remains an offer, contingent on the PEA's acceptance of the board's five non-salary proposals.

The offer probably will remain in limbo until the two sides meet again at the bargaining table, which could happen before the end of this week. Until that time, another stalemate exists with the board waiting for a move from the PEA.

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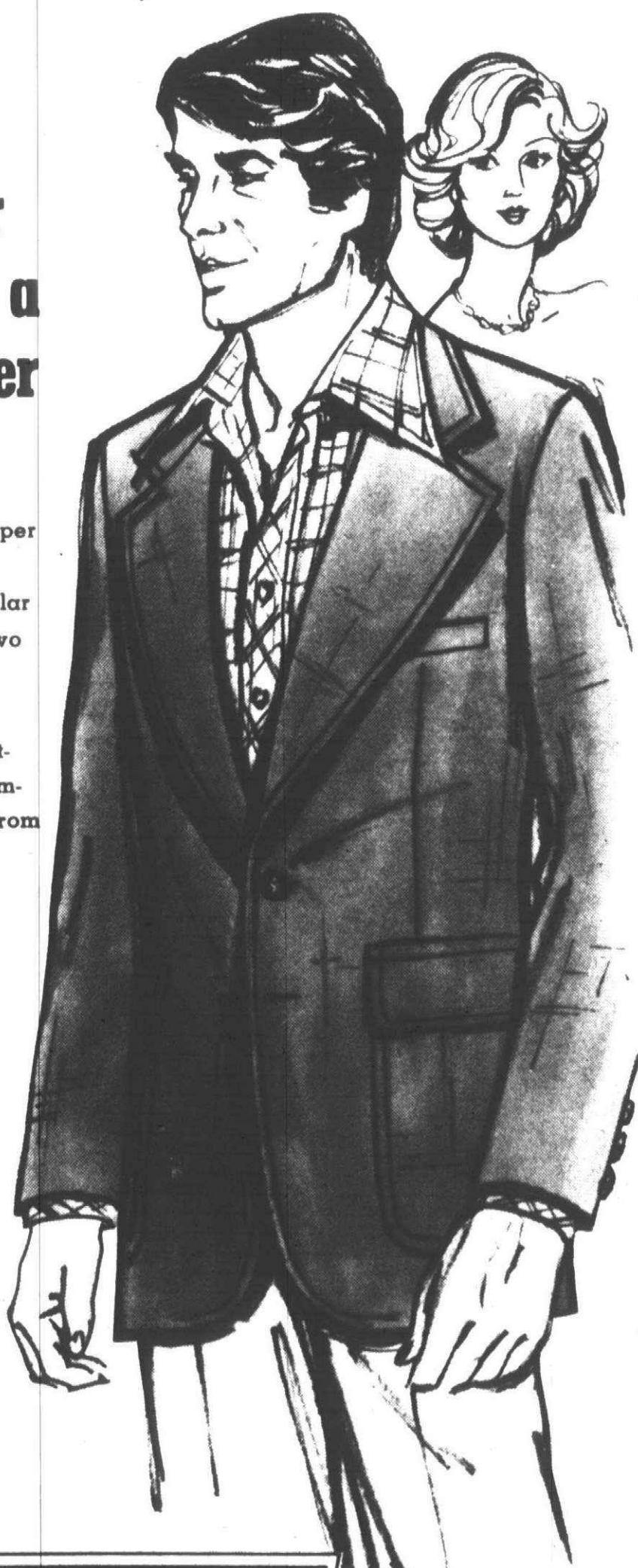

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# Schoolcraft may enter retail trade

Schoolcraft College soon may go into retailing. The hand-tailored product will be information. The buyers will be small and medium-sized businesses, in the communities Schoolcraft serves. The price to businesses—negligible. At its March 30 meeting, the Schoolcraft Board of Trustees will consider accepting a grant to join project SEM-TAP (Southeastern Michigan Technical Assistance Program). If trustees vote to accept this year's \$5,000 grant from the Economic Development Administration, it may pave the way for substantial funding at a later date, according to college president C. Nelson Grote.

The project will make technical information discovered through federal research more available to business and industry.

The community college would serve as a pipeline for the "technology transfer."

Ronald Griffith, dean of Schoolcraft's community services, last week at a study session described the school's role as a conduit.

"THE KEY word here is technology transfer. The small business person, and some of the smaller firms in industry, have not taken advantage of the knowledge available to short circuit design problems."

The community college would be the mechanism to get the information into Michigan. We would also be the first in line to take advantage of the information.

If Schoolcraft decides to accept the grant, it would join a network of other community colleges in southeastern Michigan and the "wholesaler" in the operation, an Ann Arbor-based think-tank called ERIM (Environmental Research Institute of Michigan).

Griffith said ERIM has a history of working with federal agencies, particularly those concerned with federal research and development. It would offer "staff and facilities that provide an impressive local resource for technical assistance and contacts with

other technical resources such as universities."

The first year goals of the program would be modest, Griffith said. Most of the grant would be used to inform the community of the project's existence.

Future funds could amount to \$250,000 a year, Grote said.

## County offers food program

Up to 3,000 additional people could have an extra \$25 worth of essential food items each month by calling for an appointment to seek certification for the WIC Program.

The Wayne County Health Department was recently funded by the USDA to bring WIC (Women, Infants & Children Supplemental Food Program) to 5,000 out-county low-income residents who qualify either through nutritional or medical risk factors.

WIC seeks to supplement the diets of women during pregnancy and for six months postpartum, and infants and children through age 4½. Books of coupons are distributed monthly which can be used at WIC-approved stores in Wayne County to purchase formula, milk, eggs, cheese, juice and cereal. These approved stores are both chain and independent stores located in communities across the out-county area.

Individuals may seek certification by either a public health nurse or nutritionist.

Residents of out-county areas north of Michigan Avenue, including Garden City, Westland, Wayne, Canton, Plymouth, Northville, Redford, Livonia, Dearborn and Dearborn Heights should call the Wayne County Department of Health at 274-2800, ext. 234.

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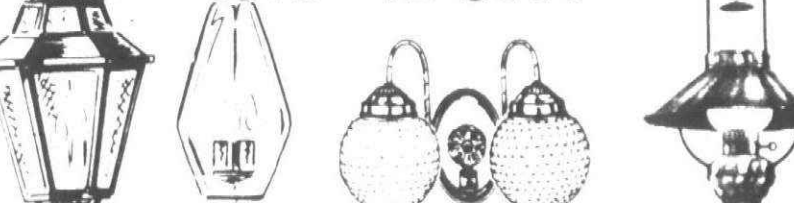
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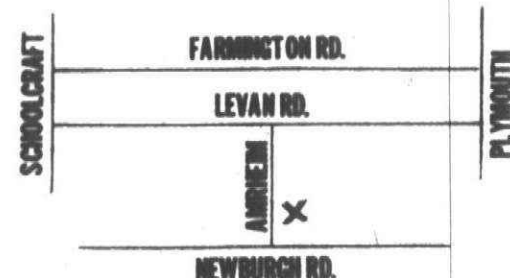

## SC child care center given first license

The Schoolcraft College child care center has received its first provisional certificate of approval from the Michigan Department of Social Services under a new state law.

While the center has been open a number of years, licensure was not required previously because the law had waived the requirement for educational institutions.

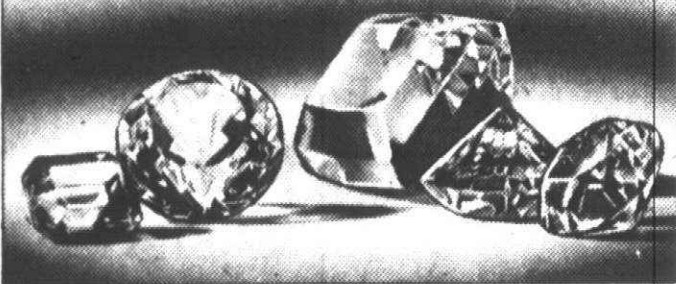

The center is located in the first house next to the south student parking lot on Haggerty between Six and Seven Mile roads in Livonia.

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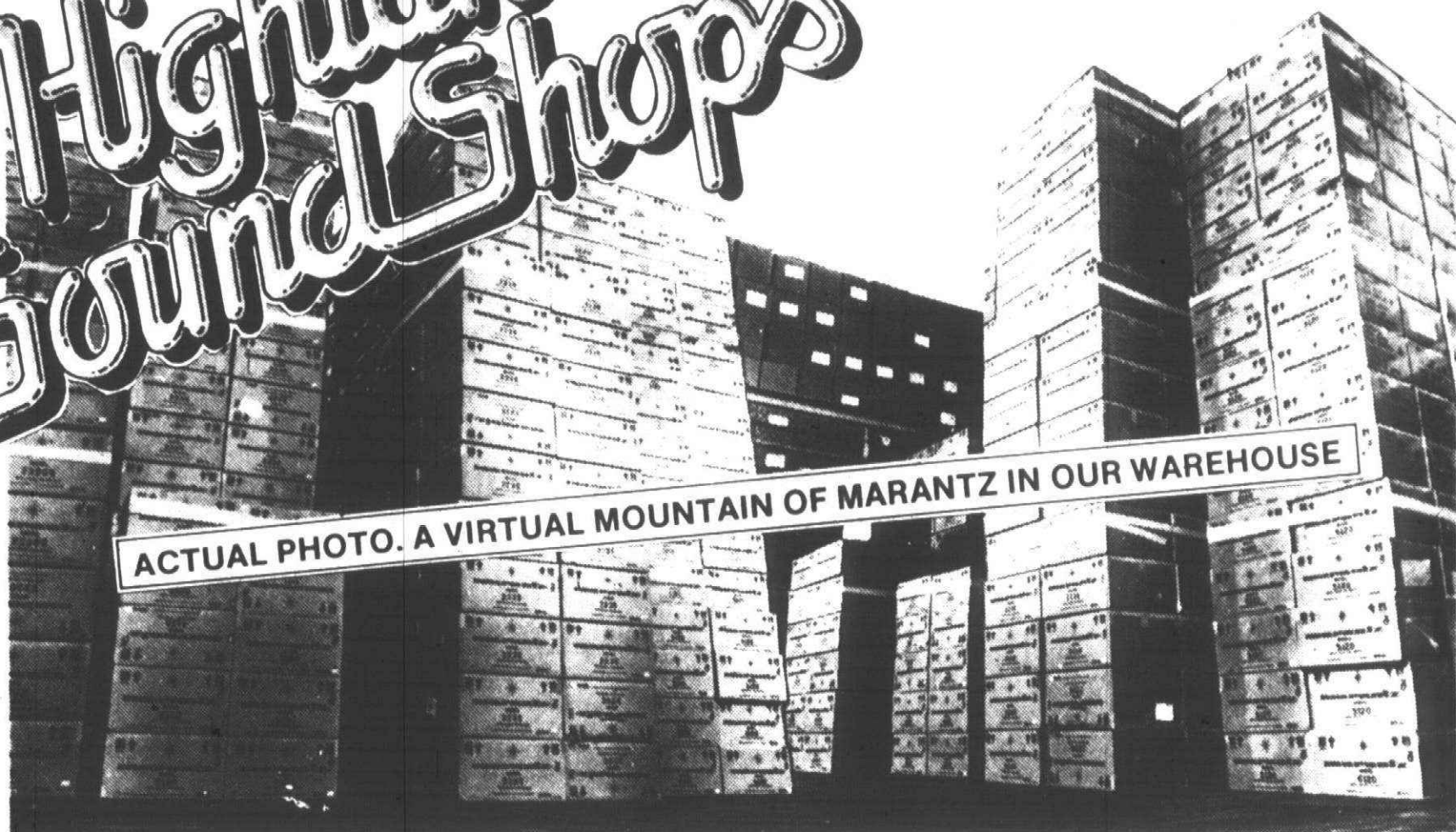
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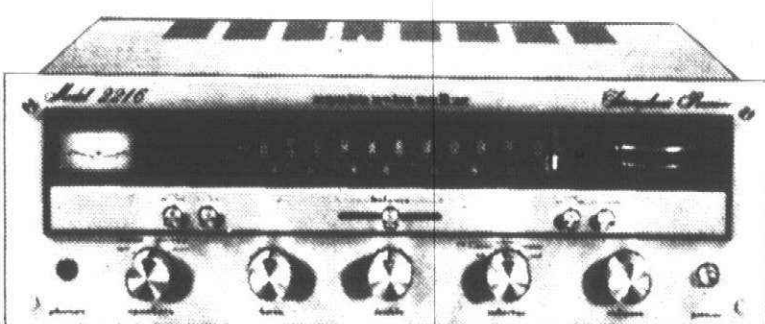
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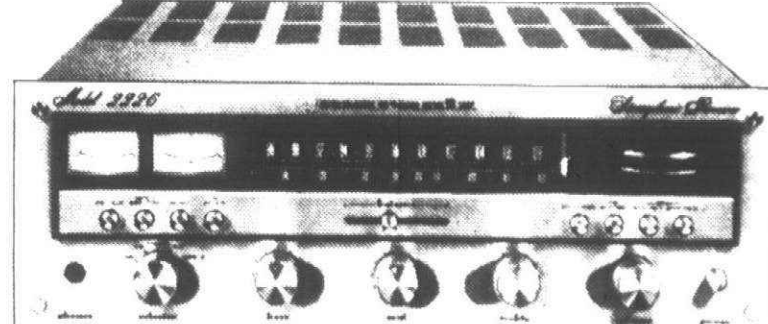
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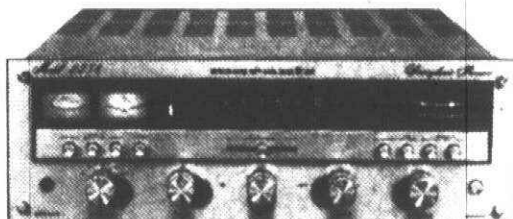
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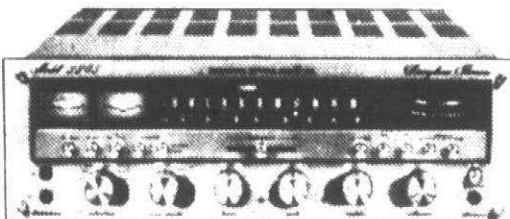
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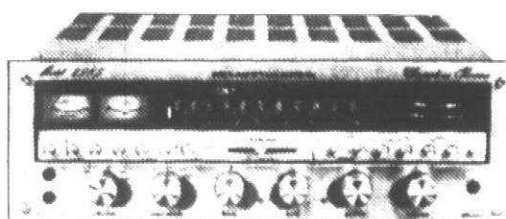
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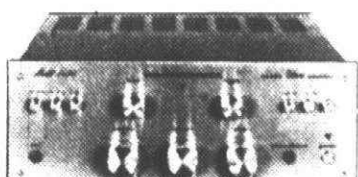
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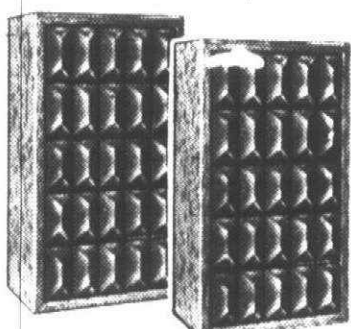
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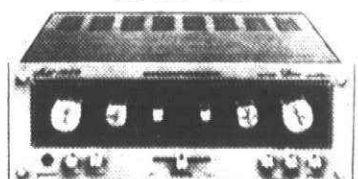
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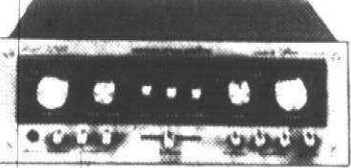
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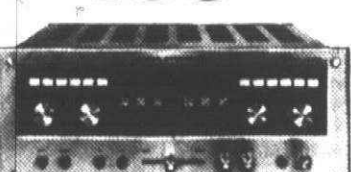
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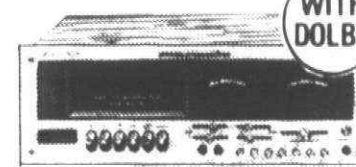
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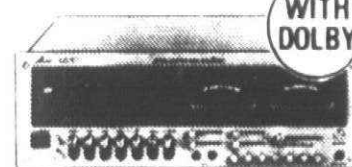
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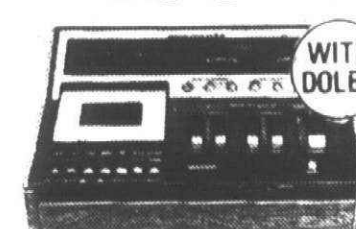
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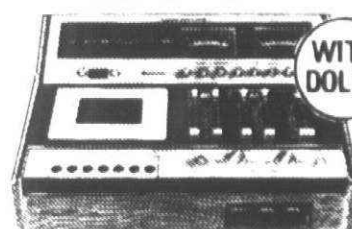
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## The Stroller:

# Life without energy

When President Jimmy Carter took to the air waves the other night to sound a warning that our nation may be without energy by 1980, he caused a lot of eyebrow lifting.

One of the younger generation, on hearing the warning and fearing the worst, asked, "My God, what will we do? How can we get along without gas and electricity?"

Before anyone could answer, he continued, "Just think what that means. We wouldn't have radio or television. We would have no lights and what would we do for heat?"

Then, turning to The Stroller, who is many years his senior, the young lad asked, "Just what will we do?" He seemed frustrated just at the thought.

Well, for the benefit of the other young folks in the present generation, even if we do run out of energy such as gas and oil—and that means gasoline, too—things won't be as bad as they might seem. In fact some things might even be more enjoyable.

When The Stroller was a young lad we lacked many of the things we have today.

WHEN WE were told, along about the turn of the century, that the day was not far away when we could have a little box in our home that would bring us the voices of people giving us the news of the day, we listened in disbelief.

Finally, it came. It was the strangest thing. When the little machine was turned on, folks not only listened but sat and watched it. Imagine what folks would think today if you

told them you were going home to watch radio.

Now, we not only have radio in our homes, but in our autos. The world is brought right to our seat at the steering wheel while going along the highway.

Before radio we had music in the home. But it was from what we called the talking machine. It was a Victrola that played records and you had to wind up the spring with each playing.

At the same time we had kerosene lamps—the forerunner of the electric light. It was the duty of the young folks in each home to see that the lamps were filled with the fuel and each Saturday time was taken out to trim the wicks.

And automobiles. They were for the rich. The rest of us walked. We walked to school. We walked to the neighborhood grocery store (there were no supermarkets) and we walked to church regardless of how far it was or the weather.

The Stroller well recalls one Sunday morning when, about a half mile from home, he got stuck in the snow drifts. It was a precarious moment, for at the time he had a perfect attendance record in Sunday school and he was afraid he would miss. Fortunately, he was rescued in time and his record remained intact.

THEN ALONG came television and our entire lives changed. People now sit at home and watch the entertainment on the screen and watch events almost as they happen. The news not only comes to your door, but football and baseball games are played in living color right in your living room.

With all this, the old-time neighborhood visits passed from the scene. The old-time poker and pinocle clubs that were the highlights of entertainment, vanished. Everyone remained home and watched television.

Having the pictures come into your home also did away with conversation. In the days before the tube, families used to sit around after a meal and chat during the evening. It was fun talking with your parents. These chats are gone now.

## Rush for passports expected this year

The U.S. Postal Service expects passport applications made at post offices this year to reach an all-time high. Postmaster Joseph J. Loukotka said. The Detroit post office is one of about 220 postal facilities in the 13-state central region that accepts applications for passports.

His prediction is based on reports from the passport office of the U.S. State Department which say that passports being issued this year are running ahead of the same period in 1976, and that a substantial increase for 1977 is expected.

Loukotka said passports issued in

1976, a record year, increased some 16 per cent over 1975, and the postal service, one of several organizations accepting passport applications for the state department, accepted more than 725,000 in 1976, compared with 706,000 in 1975. Post Offices in Wayne County issued 18,496 last year.



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Strawberries are just about everybody's favorite small fruit, yet if you want the real mouth-watering strawberry flavor and true fragrance, you must grow your own. Because only fully ripened strawberries are the real thing. This doesn't mean you need a large garden patch or even several 20 foot rows in order to produce a harvest—you can grow a respectable crop in a very small area. And as a matter of fact, you can grow them in a BARREL OR WOODEN TUB. There is nothing really new about these methods—people have been growing strawberries in barrels for ages in Europe and, to some extent, here.

You can even grow a crop on a small apartment terrace, provided you have plenty of sun and water and feed your plants regularly. Early spring is the best time to set in a crop of strawberry plants. There are some fine new varieties of repeat-cropping strawberries that give more than one harvest a season. Strawberries are perennial plants, so they will last for years. And you can root baby plants that dangle from runners, using them to replace the parents when fruiting declines in a few years. Further, even between harvest, strawberry planters are decorative assets to your garden.

BARREL AND TUBS: A WOODEN BARREL IS BEST, for a metal one is likely to heat up too much in summer's sun and this is bad for plant roots. You can use an old barrel except one that contained pickles, vinegar or sauerkraut. Old barrels are obtainable in a hardware store or shop catering to home-made wine hobbyists, such as American Hardware. Before you use an old one, scrub out the interior with a stiff scrubbing brush and two or three washings of strong detergent, then rinse well. (Salt or other materials might have been in it that will kill plant roots). Bore a row of 1 1/2 inch holes 6 inches up from the bottom, spacing them 6 to 8 inches apart. Measure first and make a mark where the center of each hole will be, so they will be evenly spaced, for the barrel circumference changes on each row. Make a second row about 6 inches above the first, then a third row, and so on till you reach 4 to 6 inches from the top. Stagger each row of holes so that they center between those of the row below.

In the bottom, bore 1/4 inch holes for drainage—eight to 16, according to the size of the barrel or tub. Then roll the barrel to its permanent site and set it up on three or four bricks to keep it off the ground. Filled with soil, barrel get too heavy to move easily. Cover the bottom with a layer of coarse gravel 3 inches deep. On the top of the gravel center a tall 1 pound coffee can with both top and bottom removed and fill it with gravel or sand. Then fill the space around it with soil, gravel or sand. Then fill the space around it with soil, packing it down till it reaches about the center of the first row of holes.

Trim the roots of the strawberry plants (see sketch) and remove all dead or yellowed leaves, leaving three to six healthy ones. Working from inside the barrel, plant one strawberry plant in each hole till the junction of roots and crown barely reaches the inside of the barrel. Place each plant near the top of its hole to allow for settling of the soil. Spread roots fan-wise, pack soil over them till the hole is covered.

When the whole row is planted, water the soil gently with a fine spray till it is soaked. Let it settle for a few minutes, then with a gentle twisting motion, lift the coffee can until its bottom nearly reaches a level of the soil. Refill the can with sand or gravel, then pack soil around it as before. Plant a row of strawberry plants in the holes at that level. Proceed with planting one row at a time, lifting the can and filling it. When the can top is level with the barrel top, leave the can in place and do not fill the top 4 to 6 inches with gravel.

The sketch of the cut-out barrel shows the column of gravel that has been created through the center of the soil. This will be the place for watering, a kind of "watering column." If you like, you can plant a colorful annual plant in a pot that fits into the can, removing it when watering is needed. Plant a row of strawberries 8 inches apart in the top of the barrel.

Editor:

This letter is in reference to my motion to postpone the April 23 bond election until the board of education's regular June election. This action was taken for three reasons:

• It was my position that additional information was required (in the form of board action) before voting on the bond issue.

• It was my hope that a resolution to delay might result in swifter decision making by the board.

• It was my feeling that there was insufficient time to supply the electorate with adequate information on which to base a positive decision.

As far as reasons one and two are concerned, the board of education has taken action on: 45-15, the design of the new facilities, the possible construction of a new high school, and the establishment of an attendance boundary committee.

Yet to be acted upon are alternative plans for 1977-78 if the bond issue or millage request (or both) are defeated. Both plans have been discussed extensively, but as yet no formal action has been taken.

Given the present body of information, I am now fully prepared to vote in favor of the bond issue. A delay in a yes vote by the electorate will only produce more over-crowding, more bussing, more disruption, and in my opinion, reduced student achievement

and reduced property values.

The one point which does deserve consideration is the necessity of providing the electorate with sufficient information on which to make a decision.

As to whether a plan exists to accomplish this, you are cordially invited to attend the election kick-off to be held on March 28 at Plymouth-Canton High School.

I can assure you the board has spent more than 100 hours studying the complexities of the bond issue.

It is my hope that each citizen will

take the necessary time to read the information provided and make a decision he or she can live with.

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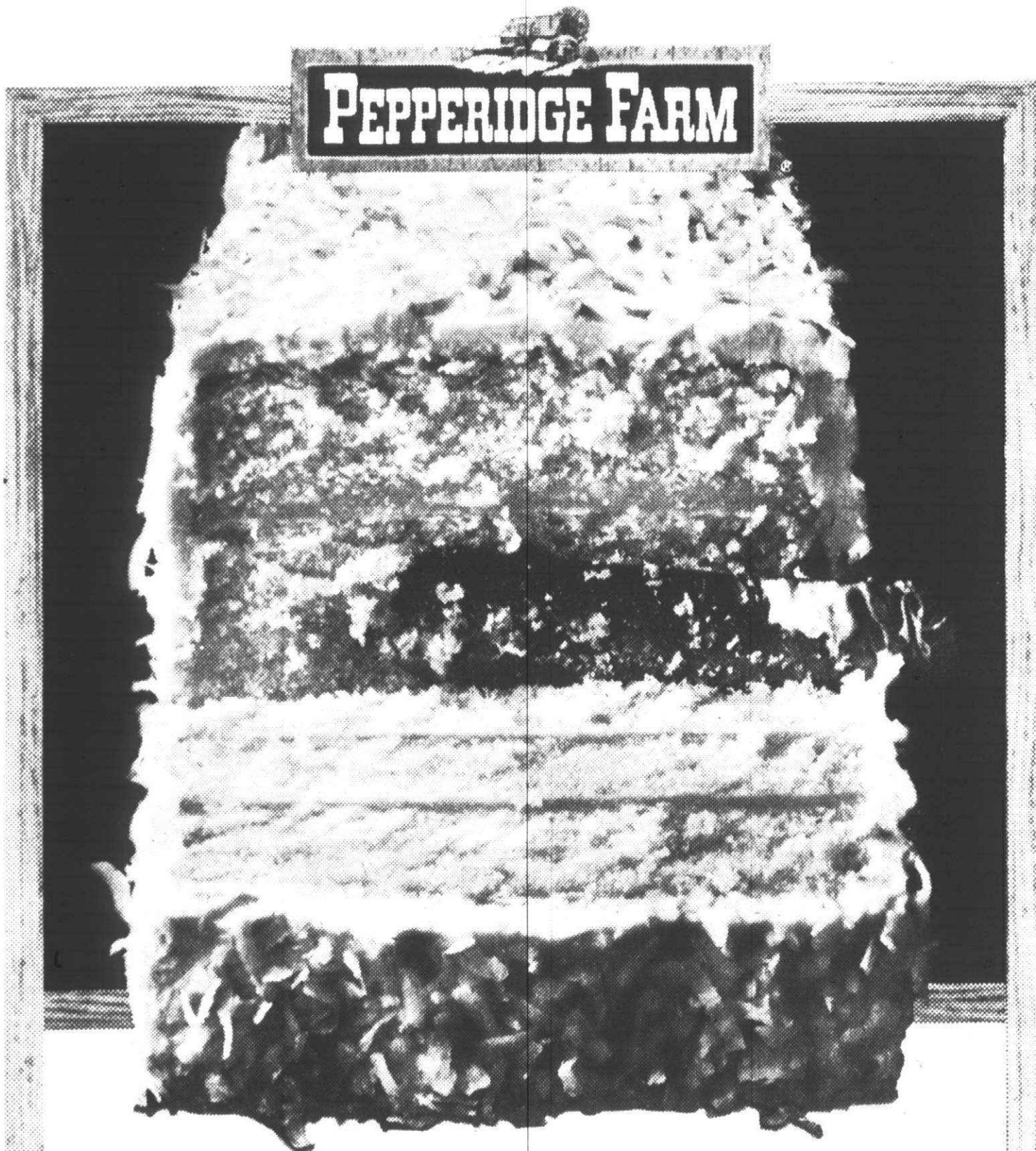

### Dropout tells problems at Salem, Canton high

Editor:

I have been reading the articles about attendance problems at Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools. As a dropout I would like to say how it really is at the schools.

I don't feel absenteeism is the parents' fault. I have seen parents try to get kids to their classes but they cannot follow them all day and walk them to their classes.

My parents busted their backs to try to get me to my classes. My mom made out reports and gave them to my teachers to fill out. All they had to do was write yes or no answers to a couple of questions and write down the number of times I had not been in class. She could not even get a 20 per cent cooperation.

The principal of Salem and my counselor said they would make sure the teachers filled them out. She still didn't get very many of those reports. I was put on structured scheduling—that is where I had to be at a certain place all through the day and get my schedule signed by the teacher in charge. The teachers got mad when I asked them to sign and told me to forge their names.

My counselor kept asking me to see the school psychologist so I finally did. The psychologist was real nice when my mom was there but as soon as she left he said that it was my parents' fault. 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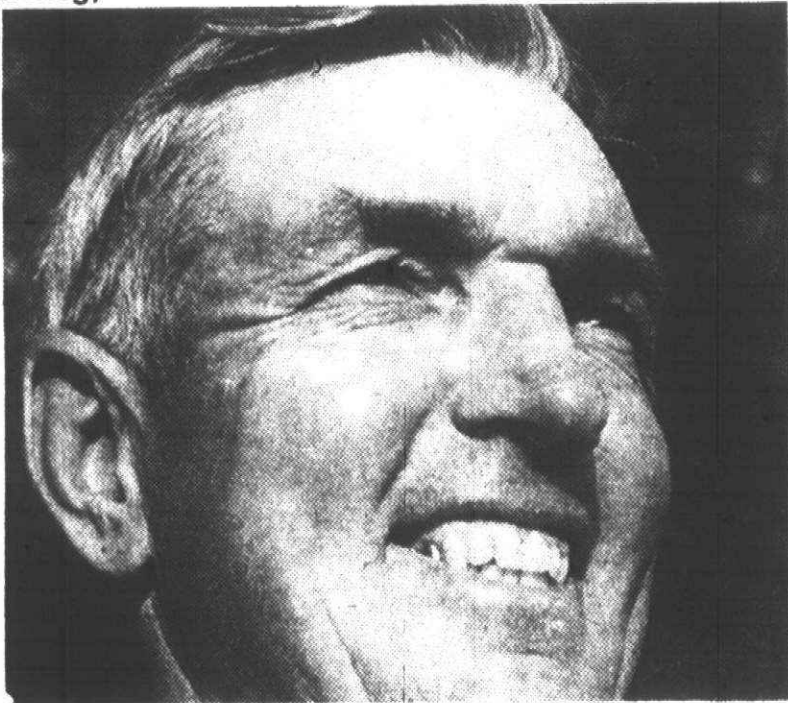


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# Reader's forum

This is intended to further clarify the position of the Plymouth Education Association in regard to recently publicized plans to expand the 45-15-ESY program beyond the confines of Miller School.

Further expansion and implementation of this concept by unilateral dictate of the board of education and central administration is clearly in violation of the contract under which Plymouth teachers are now working and are expected to continue working pending ratification of a new master agreement.

The PEA is accused of demanding "all of the pie." Meanwhile, administrative reshuffling and additions of doubtful value continue unabated coupled with incredibly unrealistic salary increases for top echelon managers.

It is an unwritten priority of the board of education that teachers "give, give, give" (or resign) in order that administrators may proportionately "Take, take, take?" Is the cry for teacher accountability to everyone intended to balance board of education and administrator accountability to no one?

It is a strange and ludicrous paradox that while the professional teachers are constantly subjugated to the whims of omniscient school boards who deride just goals and objectives as "money hungry," "self-serving," etc.

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
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

# Open meetings challenge officials' attitudes

Many public officials who bitterly (if quietly) fought the state's new Open Meetings Act are now saying the new law, which takes effect April 1, will have little effect on them. They're wrong.

The Open Meetings Act, though not a model piece of legislation, nevertheless does make some fundamental changes in the way policymaking boards, commissions and councils in state and local government operate.

The big change must be in the attitudes local officials have toward the public. "Trust us good ol' boys" is the song of the past. Even the lawyers to whom our officials turn for advice haven't grasped that elemental fact.

There are three basic changes in the way governing bodies will have to operate.

**UNDER THE OLD** system, closed meetings—euphemistically called "executive sessions"—were a way of life. A board simply didn't discuss

certain subjects in public, and that was that.

The new law allows closed meetings on certain limited topics, but there must be a two-thirds roll call vote of the board in order to close the meeting.

That's not all: The purpose(s) for which the meeting is closed must be stated in the minutes.

On top of that, the board must keep for 366 days minutes of what occurred at the closed meeting. A judge can require that the minutes be made public if this law is invoked in court.

The whole idea is to make our leaders think twice before closing a meeting. They should now ask themselves: "Is this secrecy really necessary?" If they don't reflect on the need for secrecy, then voters and reporters should start challenging them.

It's significant that the new law provides: "Nothing in this act shall prohibit a public body from adopting . . . a greater degree of openness

relative to meetings of public bodies than the standards provided for in this act."

**THE NEW LAW** provides governments with fewer excuses for closed door meetings.

In the past, they closed the door for discussions of employee and student discipline cases. The doors may still be closed now—but only at the request of the employee or student.

Meetings may be closed for discussions of collective bargaining, purchase and lease of real estate and consultations with an attorney on pending litigation.

Again, we point out that closing the door should never be automatic. The intent of the law is that public officials stop and really think about whether secrecy is necessary. Often they could decide that their past secrecy was anti-public and even paranoid. Secrecy should no longer be a way of

life in our local governments.

**FINALLY, THE NEW** law has teeth.

For a first offense of intentional violation, a public official may be fined up to \$1,000. For a second offense within the same term of office, the official may be fined up to \$2,000 and imprisoned for up to a year.

Moreover, it will be possible for the official to be personally liable for actual and exemplary damages of up to \$500.

The fly in the ointment is that the people can't always tell if their government officials are doing bad things if the officials meet in secret. It will take a lot of close watching to make openness in government a reality.

We in the newspaper business, as guardians of the public trust, realize we have prime responsibility for keeping watch over our officials. We will do our best.

## Should man bite hot dog?

This editorial is being written by a person who enjoys nothing better than a coney island hot dog dripping with spicy chili and oozing with onions.

So don't write this article off as the rantings of a health food fanatic.

It's just that the statewide concern about eating milk and meat products—in light of the PBB contamination controversy—is enough to even make someone with an iron stomach think twice before biting that dog or burger.

Dr. Richard Copeland, chief chemical analyst at the Environmental Research Group (ERG) in Ann Arbor, told the Observer & Eccentric last week that he has found no detectable trace of PBB in meat or milk taken from groceries in the past year. The contamination occurred almost entirely in 1973 and '74, he claims. That's reassuring in part, but the demand for food safety should not end here.

**PBB IS ALREADY** in our bodies. Because it is a sturdy chemical, it is likely to remain there for the rest of our lives.

Some people use the ostrich technique in assessing articles about PBB, and now PCP, a wood preservative that has entered the food chain. These persons calm justified fears by calling the whole food contamination controversy a "media fad."

They argue that the whole issue is an excuse to sell newspapers. Two years ago it was Watergate, last year it was PBB and now it's PCP. "Who cares what the scientists say," said one cynic last week. We all should care about food safety.

Traces of PBB, PCP, and PCB (polychlorinated biphenol) have been identified in meat samples examined by Dr. Copeland. Even though DDT was banned more than five years ago, Dr. Copeland says he still finds traces of DDE, a DDT by-product, in meat.

Who's guilty for the intentional and unintentional contamination of food?

Dr. Copeland claims "we have no one to blame but ourselves" for demanding chemical preservatives that prolong the shelf life of a food but may shorten our own lives.

Copeland's claim is questionable. Consumers may be accessories to the national crime of poor nutrition but few of us are involved in the business of food.

We're not the ones who decided more people would enjoy brushing with "hexo, hexo, hexochlorophene," as the jingle promoted.

How many meat eaters suggested that cattle breeders ought to start feeding their herds with hormone injections called "steroids?"

**IF CONSUMERS** carry any guilt, it's for buying these products without squawking. It's for gobbling up creamfilled cupcakes and eating lunchmeat of questionable origin on bread that stays "fresh" for three weeks.

For every tragic mistake such as the Nutrimaster-Firemaster mixup that put poison in our food chain, there are chemicals deliberately added to our food.

Let's let food companies know we don't want chemically induced flavor enhancers and preservatives. When we buy a canned ham we don't want it pumped up with water and chemicals.

Convenience isn't a substitute for nutrition.

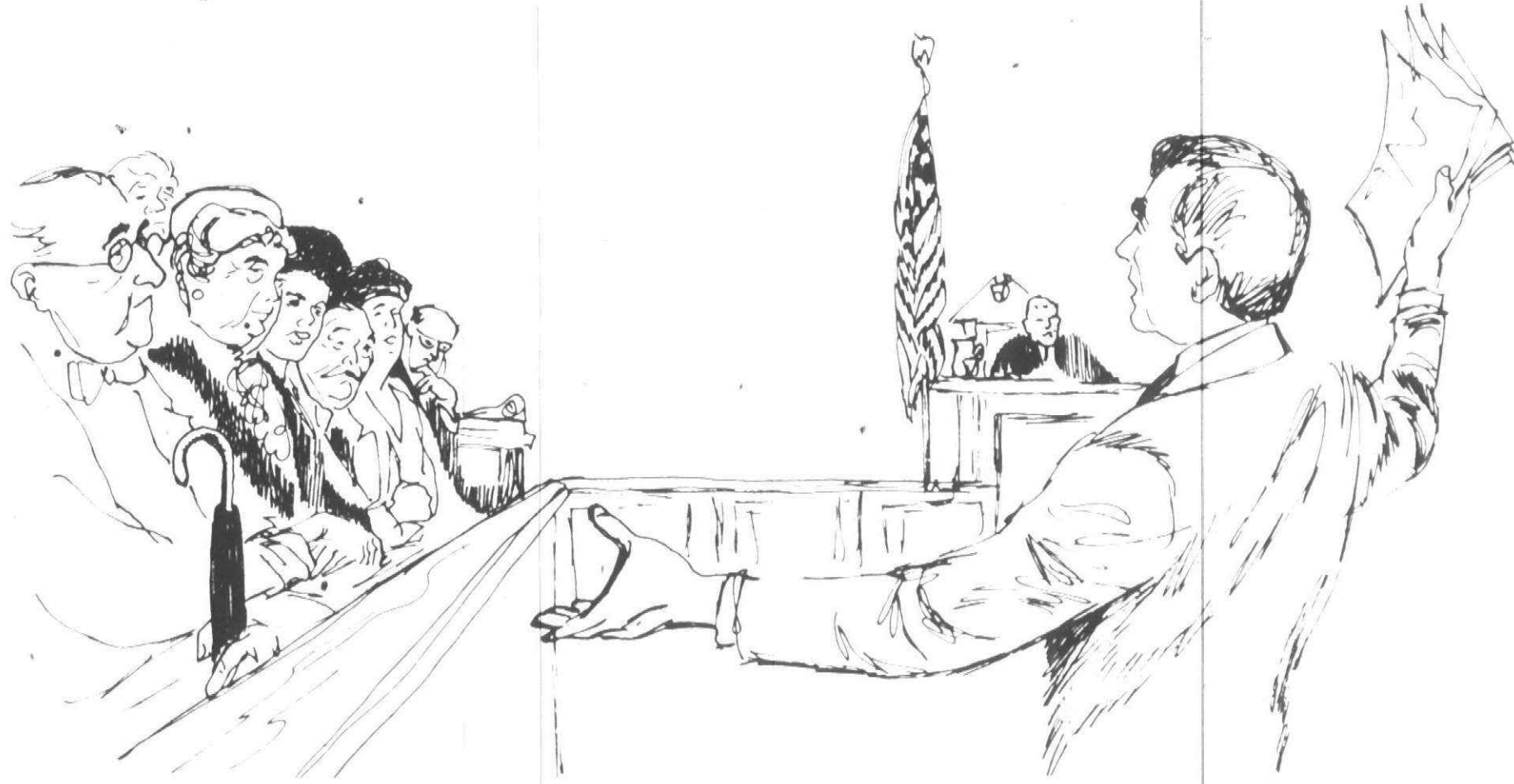
### The wisdom gap

### Suspects plead guilty anyway

## There's no savings with plea bargaining

What's plea bargaining?

Listen to Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson, and you'll conclude it's immoral, unlawful, and fattening. Listen to the harassed judges and prosecuting attorneys, and you'll find it's the only expedient to keeping up with the work load in the courts.

Plea bargaining is the practice of defense lawyers negotiating with prosecutors to reduce the original charge (say, murder) in order to get a guilty plea to a lesser charge (say, manslaughter). This eliminates the need for a lengthy trial.

Opponents say that the practice corrodes the integrity of the criminal justice system, since it does not punish criminals for the crime they actually commit and makes the courts little more than a forum in which lawyers negotiate the level of the charge.

Supporters say that the courts are already so overloaded that without plea bargaining the backlog of untried cases would become impossible.

**PLEA BARGAINING** came home to the suburbs this week in two ways.

•Farmington District Judge Michael Hand took a call last Friday at 5 p.m. from an official at Detroit Records Court, one of the most heavily overloaded courts in the state. "You are to report to the court at 9 a.m. on Monday," the official said, with the weight of the state supreme court's order to promptly reduce the Records Court backlog behind him. "I'll be there," Hand replied, and that's where he is this week.

•Word recently seeped out that the Wayne County prosecutor's staff has been quietly refusing to plea bargain with defendants charged with armed robbery. Reason for the secrecy was to avoid criticism that refusal to plea bargain would clog the courts with long trials. But a review completed last week shows that most armed robbery suspects plead guilty to the original charge anyway, even though it means a certain prison term.

"We compared the period from December 1976 through February 1977 with the same period last year, and found that the number of armed robbery defendants going to trial hardly changed at all," said Chief Assistant Prosecutor Dominick Carnovale.

**THIS EVIDENCE** is extremely important. It prevails against the main argument for plea bargaining as an essential, if uncomfortable, expedient to quick administration of justice.

No doubt evidence from just armed robbery cases is inadequate to make a generalization that banning plea bargaining would do little to in-

crease the number of jury trials. But the numbers are suggestive that all the sound and fury produced by plea bargaining proponents may not stand up under scrutiny.

What I don't understand is why nobody ever thought to test the idea until now.

**SOME JUDGES** do make the argument that not all cases of plea bargaining are wrong.

Some warrants written in haste are "over-

written" from the start, and as evidence comes in, they need to be "written down" to make the charge fit the facts.

Some cases—such as a man with an unblemished driving record who is charged with drunken driving—may require a fairness test which takes individual circumstances into account when reducing the original charge.

Both these methods of reducing an original charge are not, strictly speaking, plea bargaining. Further, they can be arranged at the arraignment or preliminary examination rather than waiting for the start of a full-blown trial.

My own view is that plea bargaining has no argument for it other than expediency—and that argument is now under real question. Systems should be worked out to allow inappropriate warrants to be amended or charges reduced in individual cases, but plea bargaining is inherently wrong and should be severely curtailed.

## Quest for people's rights threatens majority rule in U.S.

Abraham Lincoln hoped that "government of the people, by the people and for the people," would not perish from this earth.

The founding fathers of our nation apparently did not totally agree with Lincoln when they wrote the constitution because they severely limited the voice of the people.

They created three branches of government: the legislative, the judicial and the executive.

**IN THE ORIGINAL** constitution, half of the legislature was designated for election by popular vote—the house of representatives.

The other half, the senate, was elected by state legislatures. Later, by constitutional amendment, this was put in the hands of the people, but not originally.

The federal judiciary is appointed by the president with the advice and consent of the senate. The people have no say about who serves or who should serve in this important branch.

The chief executive, or president, of course, is elected by the electoral college. I have in frustration discussed this many times before, but very few seem to want to do anything about giving this prerogative to the people.

**MAYBE OUR FOREFATHERS** were correct in not entirely trusting the people. Our country grew and prospered when popular input was rejected.

But this is not what America is all about. We pride ourselves on our freedom and self-government.

During the 200 years of our country's existence, we have moved more to Lincoln's view than that of the original founding fathers.

**THE QUESTION IS:** Has the pendulum swung so far, in terms of our quest for people's rights, that we may destroy the institution we call the United States government?

When our country was founded we were not a democracy (and really still aren't one) because our president was not elected by the people. We

were and are a republic.

We work for majority rule by the people, not government by a few of special class or birthright. Today, we are ruled by the wishes of the minority in our zeal for protecting people's rights.

What is worse is that our government is run by special-interest groups because they are organized, instead of the people who, in general, are apathetic and uninterested.

**I AM WRITING** this column in the nation's capital. As I look out my window, I am awed by the beautiful edifices surrounding me.

This morning I met a man named Andrew J. Biemiller. Several congressmen have told me that he is the most powerful man in Washington today and he runs our congress.

Who is he? He is the director of the legislative department of the AFL-CIO.

**IF HE WERE** chairman of General Motors it would be just as bad because special interest is not in the best interest of all the people of our country.

Wake up America and protect your freedom and save your government.

Don't let this government "of, by and for the people" die.

Speak up, America and your voice will be heard; keep silent and the United States will pass into the history books as another great civilization that died because no one cared enough to preserve it.

I am also a teacher and my husband is a high school graduate with no college, so we, too, come from different backgrounds. However, we are very interested in what we feel is good for kids.

I wish Mr. and Mrs. Mills had stated their definition of open schools. Before moving to Canton, our children attended an "open school."

The physical plant itself is an open space structure which facilitates multi-age grouping of students and team teaching.

We were unfamiliar with this style of education but we are very much in favor of it because the program offered to the children is individualized. Children are individuals and, as such, have different learning styles. The open-spaced school my children attended was as structured as any traditional classroom I have been in.

My biggest regret since moving to Canton is that my children are not offered a program which meets their individual needs. I prefer a program which has two or three grade levels of children working together with two or three teachers for a three-year period of time.

I feel this best meets the needs of the child. He or she becomes comfortable with the teachers and the kids and they in turn become comfortable with him or her.

AS FOR UNIFORM report forms throughout the district, perhaps there is a need, but let's have a report form that spells out specifically what the child is working on and how he is or is not mastering specific objectives.

Furthermore, if children are helped to become responsible for their actions and directed in making rational decisions, it seems to me that we wouldn't have the problems we do have accepting modular scheduling in the high schools.

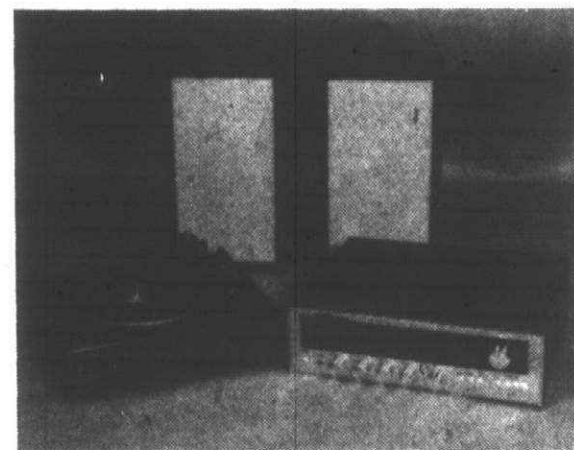

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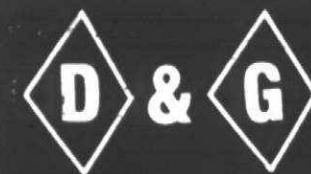
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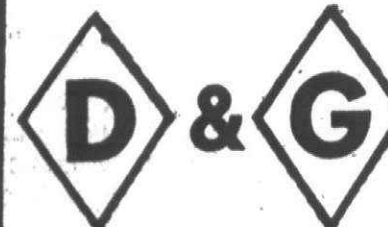

## In Livonia, Garden City

# GS leaders protest ERA endorsementment

A Garden City Girl Scout leader is resigning her post as neighborhood chairman and four others in Livonia have called a protest meeting in the wake of their organization's top-level endorsement of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA).

Diane Raleigh, chairman of Neighborhood 45 in Garden City, told leaders in her neighborhood last week she was writing a letter of resignation after seven years as a Girl Scout leader.

In Livonia, Neighborhood 52 council delegates Carol Rogman and Rita Dahn, along with troop organizer Carol Skamiera and a former neighborhood chairman Marie McGee scheduled a meeting at 9 a.m. next Tuesday in Mt. Hope Congregational Church on Schoolcraft to draft a written protest.

Both actions came after the leaders were informed in neighborhood meetings that the Metropolitan Detroit Council of Girl Scouts had decided to put its stamp of approval on earlier action by the Girl Scouts National Board to support ERA. If ratified, the constitutional amendment would bar discrimination based on sex.

The local women said they were told the action would be announced officially, complete with a statement from the Detroit council president, in the April issue of Knapsack, the council's monthly newsletter.

MRS. RALEIGH and the Livonia women all insisted they were acting because they felt it was wrong for the Girl Scout organization to get involved in a political issue and because they had not been consulted before the Detroit council acted.

"It's the principle," said the Garden City leader. "The council did wrong in endorsing a political issue—that's never been done before."

As to her personal opinion of ERA, Mrs. Raleigh said she finds "there's both good and bad." Her quarrel, she added, is with the organization throwing its prestige behind the issue without consulting membership.

"Neighborhood voting delegates weren't told of the decision," Mrs. Raleigh added. "We should have been."

She said she didn't know whether there would be widespread resignations.

"In my neighborhood," she explained, "most of the leaders don't like it, but they are caught in the middle. They have active troops and don't want to drop them."

THE LIVONIA WOMEN reacted in similar manner, insisting "they could have asked us how we felt."

They said it was the manner of endorsement more than the pros and cons of ERA that led to calling the meeting.

"We agree with the national board that ERA will have an impact on the present and future lives of more than three million members of our organization," said Mrs. McGee.

"That's why, at least at the council level, some attempt should have been made to see how we felt on a public issue of this magnitude."

The meeting will explore possible ways of expressing displeasure with the council action.

It will be up to the group to decide the extent of the protest.

Invited are chairmen of Livonia's 11 neighborhoods, including two in Westland, as well as service teams, council delegates and leaders and interested parents of girls in the approximately 100 troops involved.

Mrs. McGee said the action taken might be just a protest or could involve boycotting the April 20 general meeting in Cobo Hall, a session that the Livonia women contend could have been used to put the ERA matter to a vote.

"It's up to the group to decide," she added.

THE NATIONAL BOARD, in endorsing ERA several weeks ago, announced that the action represented a public statement by its 35 members and does not preclude councils, girls and adult leaders from acting on their individual opinions.

"We certainly intend to exercise that option," the four women said.

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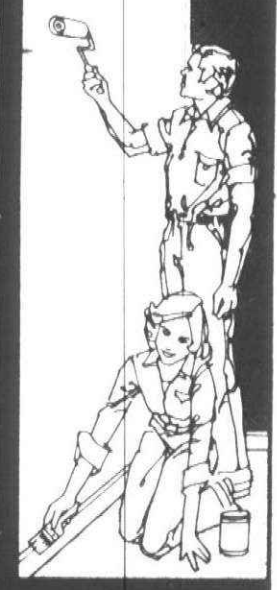


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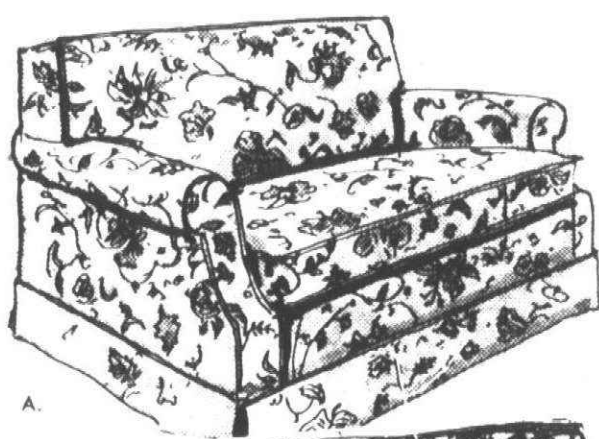
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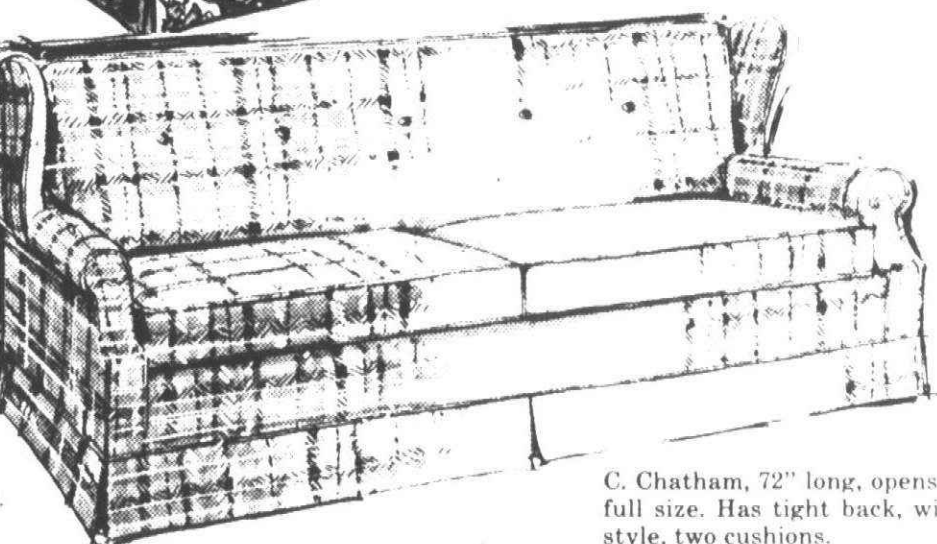
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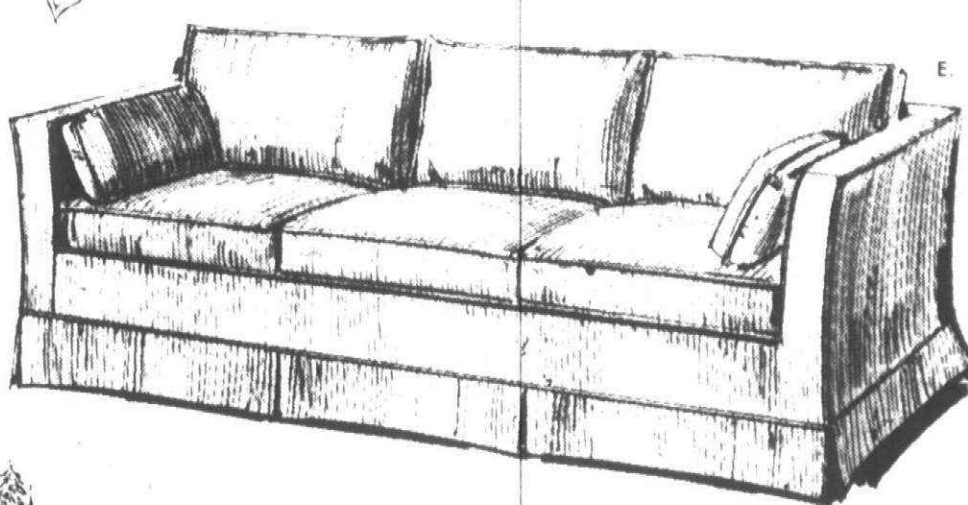
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## Catholics to convene for Pastoral Assembly

But things finally gelled this season. As Gilles put it, "We finally matured and played like I thought we could—up to our abilities."

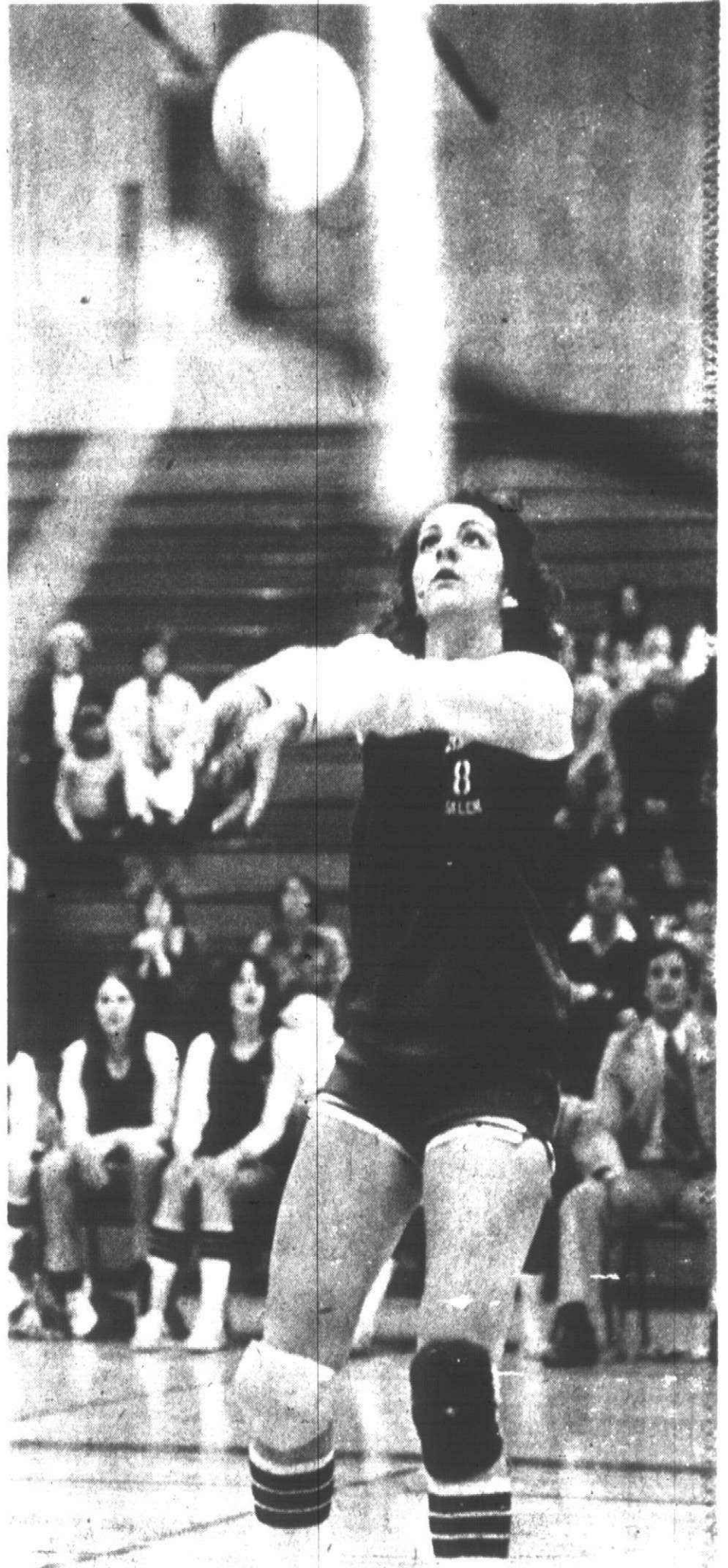
The Rocks earned a tie for that Sub-8 title last month—the first ever for this sport at Salem.

## Eli, Mandle, Hewlett cop Observer honors

The recently-concluded prep basketball campaign produced a few surprises, not the least of which was that no single squad ran roughshod over the others, as has been the case in years past.

Plymouth Salem again defended its Suburban Eight League title as did Livonia Churchill in the Western Six League. Westland John Glenn tied for the Northwest Suburban League championship.

Talent also seemed to balance out. No one individual seemed to dominate the basketball scene.

Area coaches met recently and selected 15 players for the 1976-77 all-Observer basketball teams. Here are the results:

### FIRST TEAM

**Tom Bay, Livonia Churchill.** Captain of the Chargers this season, Bay averaged 19.3 points per game this season. He also hauled down 269 rebounds and counted 57 assists.

The senior, a two-year all-Western Six League selection, holds single-season and career scoring records at Churchill of 483 and 781 points, respectively. He is second in career assists and third in steals.

"Tom is a 3.6 student and a fine team leader," said Churchill coach Pat Montano of the 6-4 forward who sparked the Chargers all the way to the regional finals.

**Dave Gilland, Livonia Stevenson.** Most Valuable Player of this year's team and an all-Inter Lakes League choice, Gilland shot at a 50 per cent clip from the field and averaged 12 points per contest.

Also an excellent student (4.15 grade point average on 4.00 scale), Gilland, a senior and two-year starter, came up with 98 assists and 51 steals this season.

"He's a point guard who made our offense go," said Stevenson coach George VanWagoner. "He led our fast break. He works very hard and is dedicated—a great person to work with."

**Dan Loacano, Garden City East.** A tri-captain of the Panthers, Loacano was a sharpshooter, averaging 19.1 points per game. The three-year letter winner, who played wing, grabbed 111 rebounds during the campaign.

East coach Billy Joe Young said Loacano has been East's best outside shooter while being closely guarded in a decade. "He has excellent ability to get open without the ball," the coach stated.

**Dan Diadiun, Westland John Glenn.** The 6-3 senior led the Rockets in several categories this season—scoring, 15.3 points per game, rebounding, 11.3 per game and free-throw shooting accuracy, 73 per cent.

Diadiun was Glenn's Most Valuable Player during both his senior and junior seasons. He was co-captain of this year's team.

"Dan played with intensity in all our games," said Glenn coach Gordon Davis. "He was an outstanding leader by performance. He was our key man on offense."

Diadiun carries a 3.7 grade point average.

**Tom Ellinghausen, Plymouth Salem.** Ellinghausen, who picked up where brother Jim left off last year, led the Rocks in both scoring and rebounding this season. He averaged 19.5 points per outing and collected 149 caroms during the campaign.

Ellinghausen had a streak of eight consecutive games during the season in which he scored 20 or more points per contest.

He shot 49.7 per cent from the field and 70.7 per cent from the free-throw line. He was an all-Suburban Eight League pick.

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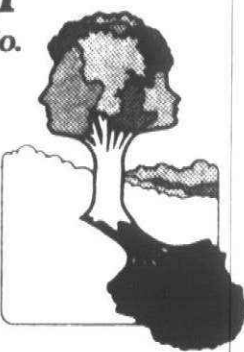

### Wrestling fans show interest

Is there any enthusiasm for wrestling at the middle school level?

What a silly question. Anyone who doesn't think that the enthusiasm is present for middle school grapplers must not have attended last Saturday's first annual Plymouth Middle School Invitational Wrestling Tournament at East.

After watching Plymouth Salem's volleyball team lose in the quarterfinals of the state tournament at Schoolcraft College, I headed over to East Middle School to watch a bit of the tourney.

On my way over, I had second thoughts about this tournament. I really questioned what kind of interest there was in the community.

Tournament organizer Dan Riggs has been fighting for years to get wrestling on this level. He finally got his wish to run a four-school tourney, and he is one to admit that he had some of the same doubts that I had.

I WALKED into the East gym at about noon-time—3½ hours after the tourney began.

When I reached the door I couldn't believe all the parents and kids crowding the area. There were hundreds of people there.

I had not yet reached the scorer's table when three different parents approached me and asked that I write something about the tournament.

These parents were extremely excited about the proceedings and credited Riggs for all the work put into it.

Among the comments I received were, "My kid's really enjoying this sport. It gives him something to do on his own. He doesn't have to

worry about passing or shooting with other players on a team. What he accomplishes is done on his own."

When I went into the office Monday afternoon, I received two more calls from parents that asked me to talk about the tournament.

ALL THIS GOES to show is that there is a definite interest in wrestling at this younger level. And it's time that the athletic department implement a middle school program for wrestling.

If a member of the athletic administration had been present at the tournament, he would agree with me that the interest is there.

It doesn't take much to start a program. It would be easy to schedule six dual-meets (completing twice against the other three Plymouth middle schools) and have a season-ending tournament.

And what a boost a middle school program would be to the two high school teams. Canton coach Dan Chrenko and Salem mentor Ron Krueger were both at the tourney for the majority of the day. And you could see the gleam in their eyes as these youngsters performed.

Why do you think that Westland John Glenn and Wayne Memorial dominate the area in this sport year after year? It's because that school system has a junior high school program.

One Plymouth Township resident told me this weekend that he has a nephew in Temperance that is competing in a grade school wrestling tournament next weekend as a result of an elementary program.

Temperance-Bedford High School won the Michigan High School

Class A state championship last month.

It's time for a middle school wrestling program in the Plymouth-Canton community. It would be beneficial for all.

If members of the athletic administration missed what a great success the tournament was last Saturday at East—I certainly hope they don't miss this column.



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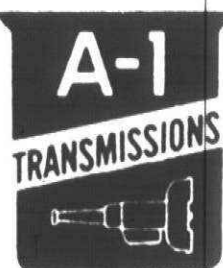
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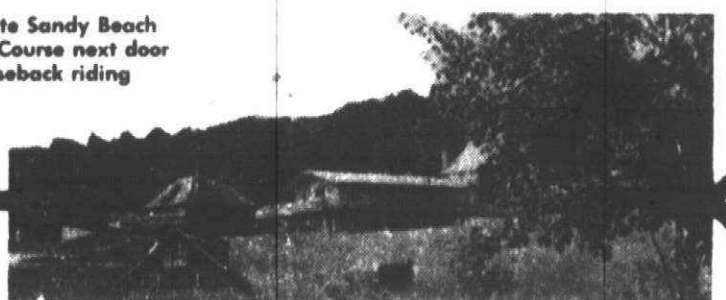


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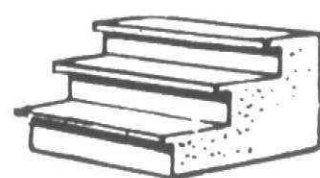
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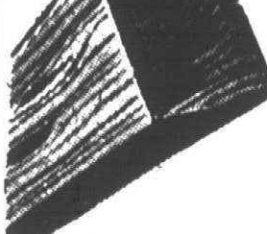
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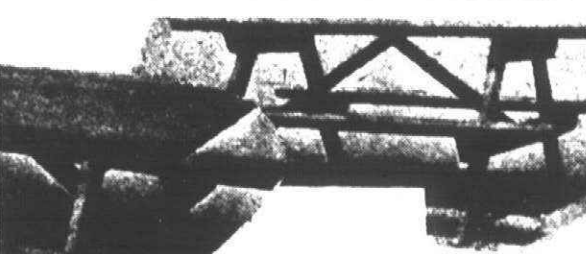


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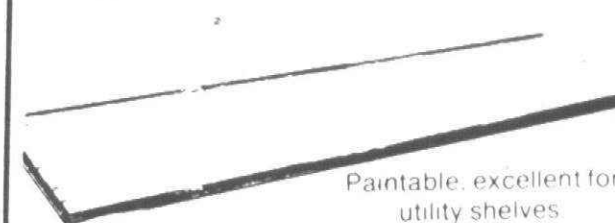
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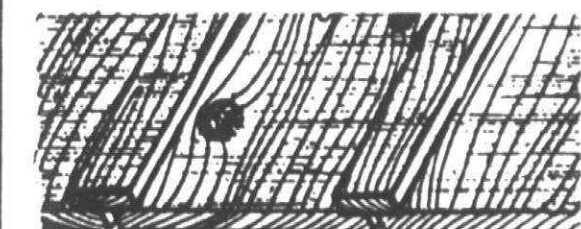

Plymouth made it 3-0 at 11:15 of the second period when Wells scored again on assists by Figurski and Williams.

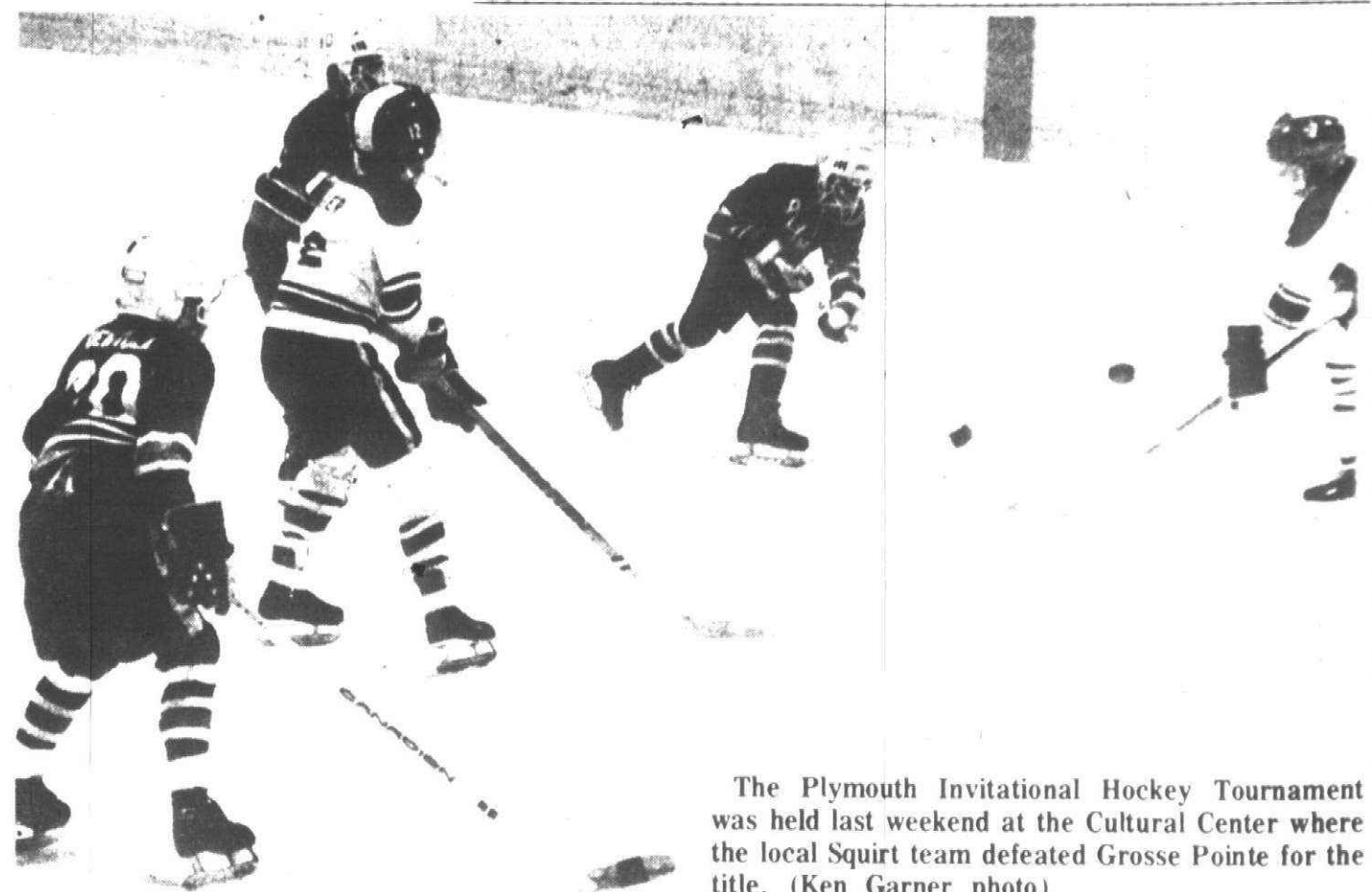

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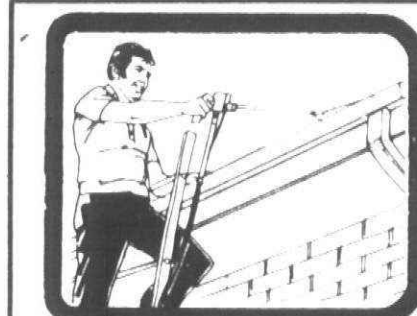
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### CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF CANTON BOARD PROCEEDINGS

A regular meeting of the Township Board of the Charter Township of Canton was held on February 22, 1977 at 7:00 P.M. at 128 Canton Center Road. Members present: Stein, Flodin, Bradley, Daley, Goldsmith, Myers, Schwall.

A motion was made by Bradley and supported by Flodin that the agenda be approved with the following additions and deletions.

1. Add appointments to sign and term growth control committees, and funding of various committees.
2. Add zoning ordinance control.
3. Remove Item No. 2.
4. Add approval of site plan for addition to Super Bowl.

Yes: Stein, Flodin, Bradley, Daley, Schwall.

No: Goldsmith, Myers.

A motion was made by Bradley and supported by Daley and carried that the minutes of January 31, 1977 be approved as corrected.

Yes: Stein, Flodin, Bradley, Daley, Goldsmith, Schwall.

Abstain: Myers.

A motion was made by Myers and supported by Flodin and unanimously carried that the minutes of February 7, 1977 be approved as presented.

A motion was made by Goldsmith and supported by Schwall and unanimously carried that the minutes of February 8, 1977 be approved as corrected.

A motion was made by Bradley and supported by Schwall and unanimously carried that the following rules for conduct of township meetings be adopted:

#### I. Meetings

- A. Regular**—The Township Board of the Charter Township of Canton shall meet on the 1st, 2nd, and 4th Tuesday of each month at the Township Fire Hall, 128 Canton Center Road. These meetings are open to the public and will convene promptly at 7 o'clock P.M.
  1. If any time set for the holding of a regular meeting of the Township Board shall be a holiday, then such regular meeting shall be held at the same time and place on the next secular day which is not a holiday.
  2. All regular and special meetings of the Township Board shall be open to the public and its rules of order shall provide that citizens shall have a reasonable opportunity to be heard.
  3. Four members of the Township Board shall be a quorum for the transaction of business at all meetings, but, in the absence of a quorum, 2 members may adjourn any regular or special meeting to a later date.
- B. Special**—Special meetings of the Township Board shall be called by the Township Clerk on the written request of the Supervisor or any 2 members of the Township Board, on at least 24 hours written notice to each member of the Township Board, designating the time, place and purpose of any such meeting and served personally or left at his usual place of residence by the Township Clerk or someone designated by him. Notwithstanding the foregoing requirements for the calling of special meetings, any special meeting of the Township Board at which all members of the said Board are present or have, in writing, waived the requirements that notice be given at least 24 hours prior to the time specified for the holding of such meeting and at which a quorum of the said Board is present, shall be a legal meeting.
 

No business shall be transacted at any special meeting of the Township Board unless the same has been stated in the notice of such meeting. However, if all the members of the said Board are present at any special meeting thereof, then any business which might lawfully come before a regular meeting of the said Board may be transacted at such special meeting.
- C. Notification**—Public notice of the time and place of regular meetings of the Township Board shall be permanently posted in a conspicuous place to be viewed by the public at two locations: the Township Business Offices, and the Township Fire Hall. Whenever possible, notice of special meetings will be posted at those two locations at least 48 hours prior to such meetings.
- D. Publication of Agenda**—Printed agendas shall be made available to the public at the two above mentioned locations by noon Thursday preceding the regular meeting.
- E. Supporting Informational Packets**—Supporting informational packets, will be made available for public inspection in the above mentioned locations by noon Thursday preceding the regular meeting. At the direction of the Township Clerk, certain items of information may be omitted from the public packets, when, in his estimation, such information may be detrimental to the welfare of the Township, or to the rights and privacy of individuals. In these decisions, the Township Clerk will be guided by the resolution of the Township Board as found in the minutes of the meeting of March 23, 1976.
- F. Agendas and Packets to Board Members**—Copies of published agendas and complete informational packets will be delivered to all members of the Township Board by noon Thursday preceding the regular meeting. These agendas and packets will be delivered personally or left at the Board member's usual place of residence or business, by the Township Clerk or someone designated by him.
- G. Agenda Cutoff**—In order to facilitate the meeting of time requirements regarding publication of agendas and availability of informational packets, all items to be included on the printed agenda will be in the hands of the Township Clerk or the Secretary to the Township Board by noon on the Wednesday prior to publication so far as it is practical.
- H. Conduct of Meetings**—Meetings of the Canton Township Board will be conducted according to Robert's Rules of Order, except as specifically noted. Recommended references are: Robert's Rules of Order Revised, General Henry M. Robert, William Morrow and Company, Inc., New York, 1971 (Paper); and The Meeting Will Come to Order, Simplified Guidelines to Parliamentary Procedure, Extension Bulletin 294, Cooperative Extension Service, Michigan Extension Service, East Lansing.
- I. Smoking**—Smoking is prohibited during regular and special meetings of the Township Board.

**J. Chair**—As a member of the Township Board, the Supervisor shall be the presiding and executive officer thereof and shall have an equal voice and vote in the proceedings of the Board. He shall authenticate by his signature such instruments as the Board and the laws of the state or the federal government may require. In the event of the absence of the Supervisor from any meeting of the Township Board, said Board shall appoint one of its members president pro tem for such meeting. In the absence of the Supervisor, the Township Clerk shall call the meeting to order and entertain a motion to appoint a temporary chairperson (president pro tem), usually the senior trustee in time of service.

**K. Voting**—The vote upon the passage of all ordinances, and upon the adoption of all resolutions and ordinances shall be taken (viva voce) by "Yes" and "No" votes and entered upon the record, except that where the vote is unanimous, it shall only be necessary to so state. If, in the opinion of the chair, a particular vote is strictly a matter of formality, or if no opposition to the motion has been voiced, he may simply state, "All those in favor, please signify by saying yes..." All those opposed, by saying no..." If the vote is other than unanimous, a roll call vote shall be taken and recorded.

**L. Abstention**—Each member of the Township Board who shall be recorded as present shall vote on all questions decided by the said Board unless excused by the unanimous consent of the other members present.

**M. Order of Voting**—For roll call votes, members of the Board will vote in alphabetical order.

**N. Seating**—The Supervisor (or chairman pro tem) will be seated in the center, flanked by the Clerk and Treasurer, with two trustees to the outside of both Clerk and Treasurer.

**O. Use of Tape Recorders**—Any member of the audience or of the Board may use a tape recorder to record regular, special, or study meetings of the Board. The Board will cause its meetings to be taped officially, and to have the tapes stored at the Township Business Offices for 90 days which is the legally accepted standard and practice. Anyone who may wish to listen to the tapes, may do so at the Township Business Office at a cost of \$8.00 per hour. This fee will cover personnel costs.

**P. Citizen Participation**—Before speaking on a particular issue, each person shall be recognized by the chair, and proceed to the center microphone to state his/her name and address for the record. Each person will be allowed to speak for three minutes on any agenda item, unless in the opinion of the chair, more time is needed.

#### Q. Special Rules—

1. A motion, to suspend the rules is not debatable or amendable and requires a 2/3 vote.
  2. Amendments to these rules and procedures may be made by a two weeks advance notice to the Board, entrance on the agenda, and a 2/3 vote.
- R. Appointments**—
1. All candidates for Board appointments or approval shall submit brief resumes or where appropriate, be available for interviews and submit references.
  2. Changes in requirements may be determined by the Board in individual cases.

#### II. SECRETARY TO THE BOARD

**A. Appointment**—The Township Clerk shall appoint, subject to the approval of the Board, a Secretary to the Board.

**B. Duties**—The Secretary to the Board shall be responsible for the following duties:

1. Assist the Township Clerk in the drawing up and publication of agendas.
  2. Assist the Township Clerk in assembling and distribution of informational packets.
  3. Be responsible for the taping of all regular, special, and study meetings of the Township Board, and the filing of those tapes.
  4. Assist the Township Clerk in the written recording of proceedings of all regular, special, and study meetings of the Township Board, and the subsequent recording of official minutes of such meetings.
  5. Conduct roll call votes and record the results of each vote.
  6. Perform other duties as determined by the Township Clerk.
- C. Compensation**—Compensation to be determined by the Township Clerk.

- J. Additions to Agenda** (made previously under item C)
- K. Agenda Requests** for following meeting
- L. Adjournment.**

## Morse, Richards eye marathon

Running in the pouring rain, high winds and a snowstorm for 26 miles on a Sunday afternoon in Ohio does not sound like an appetizing event, but for Dr. Tom Morse of Plymouth and Dave Richards of Plymouth Township, the inclement jog was rewarding.

For Richards and others like him, the Heart Watchers Marathon from Bowling Green University to the University of Toledo presented a final opportunity to qualify for next month's Boston Marathon. But for Morse, the 26.2 mile course was a challenge in itself.

"That was the first time I ever tried a marathon race," said Morse, 34, who took up running less than a year ago. "I wasn't up to it physically and with all the mental anguish, I was glad to finish."

Morse started jogging daily as a pre-

vention to cardiovascular disease. "Watching people getting their chests cracked at University Hospital got me started running real quick," Morse said. "When you're in my profession and see the number one killer take its toll on people's lives, you're anxious to do something about it."

At the urging of some friends who have been jogging for several years, Morse began running long distances last year and has been hooked ever since. He currently runs 10 miles a day through downtown Plymouth.

"MARATHON RUNNING is turning into a national pastime," Morse said. "It's fun and people of all ages are getting into it. Running is the only year-round training for heart conditioning and I think it helps you mentally, too."

"If you know you're trying to get in

shape and improve your health, you feel better about yourself."

Despite the mass number of runners in the Boston Marathon, qualifying for the race is quite an achievement. All entrants under 40 must run a 26.2 mile race in less than three hours, while those over 40 are given an additional 30 minutes.

"Qualifying for the marathon is one of the few sports where guys wait until they reach 40 to compete," Morse quipped.

Richards, 41, qualified for his fourth Boston Marathon on Sunday with a three-hour, 20-minute performance. Last year, in 100 degree heat, Richards' time in the marathon ballooned to 4 hours. He is in his fifth year of

long-distance running and hopes to better his qualifying time in April's race.

MORSE SAID he was elated to finish Sunday's marathon. "It began snowing at first and then nasty conditions set in with strong winds and cold rain."

"Immediately after the race, you swear that you'll never run again. But after a day, the aches go away and you're ready to start jogging again," Morse said.

Morse does much of his running as a member of the Livonia Family Y, which offers frequent club jogs. He said unsuccessful attempts have been made to form such a club in Plymouth.

# Used condos moving

At a recent monthly session, sponsored by the United Northwest Realty Association-Western Wayne Oakland County Board of Realtors (UNRA-WWOOR), a large group of local real estate salespeople spent their time and money to learn all they could about the mechanics of listing and selling condominiums.

Instructor for the half-day session was Kate Seymour, manager of the condominium division of Farmington Hills based Thompson-Brown Realty.

While Ms. Seymour has devoted most of her time the past three years to the sales and marketing of new construction condominiums, she said the increasing interest in condos was both encouraging and very significant.

Four years ago, interest in condos was at best lukewarm, she said. In the past two years that has changed to the point where realtors are now eager to learn all they can about condominiums in order to respond to the requests of their customers who are looking for, or planning to sell, condominium homes. The quality of resale is and of the particular condo

very important to the ongoing sale of new condominiums and one big question that first-time buyers have about condos is what is going to happen if and when I decide to sell my condominium?

Until recently, there were no easy answers to that question. Condos were still too new in Michigan.

However, recent resale statistics in the area show condominiums are reselling on a par with comparable single family detached homes in the same area—both in terms of appreciation in value and in length of time on the market.

As in any other type of housing, general economic conditions, time of year, and most importantly, condition of the home are the key factors in determining a condominium's resalability.

Ms. Seymour concludes there are five important factors influencing resale and offers these as guidelines to those who are thinking of buying a new condominium or selling their present one.

•First, as with any home, is location, both of the condominium community itself and of the particular condo

home within the community. Homes overlooking wooded areas, ravines, lakes and ponds generally sell faster—or for more money—than similar homes not as well situated (of course, the purchaser probably paid more for that location in the first place.)

•The condition of the home is important. Overfurnished, underdecorated or underloved homes have the hardest time. Make repairs and move out the excess furniture before advertising the home for sale.

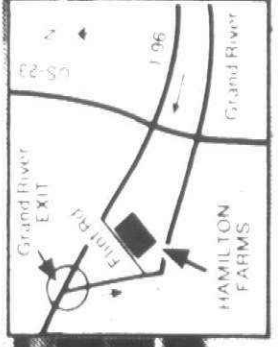
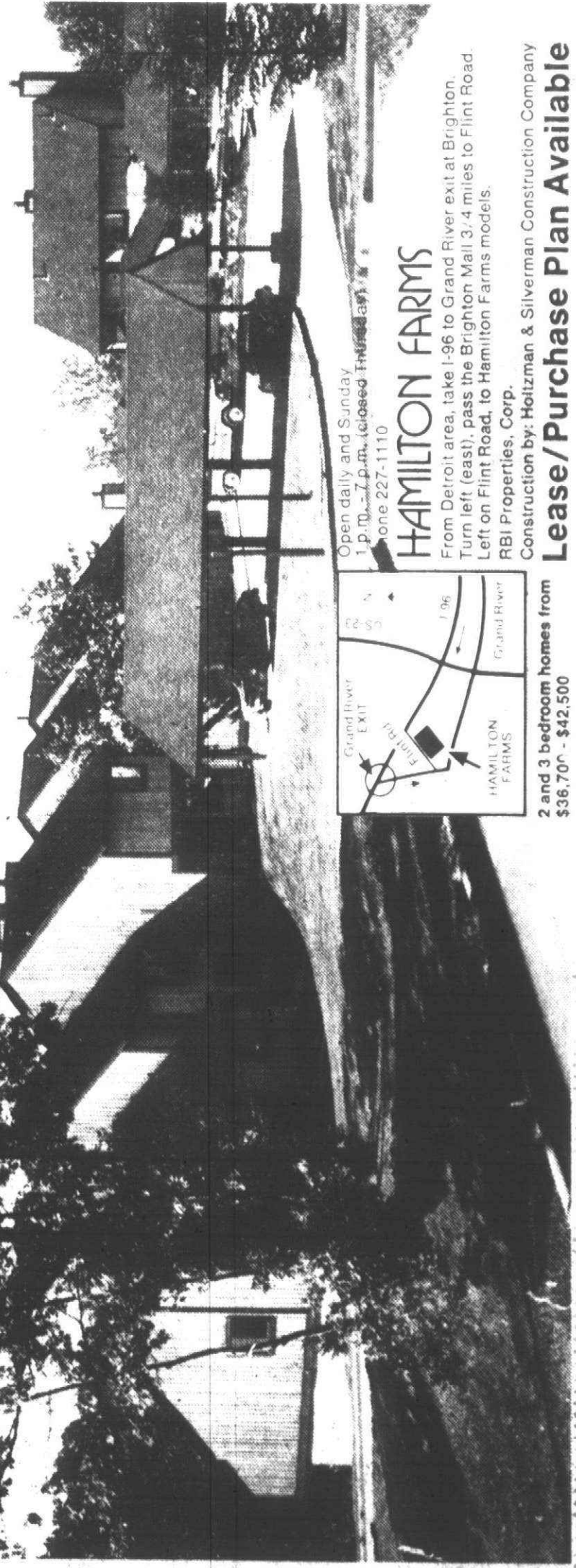
•Extremely critical is the quality of the condominium owners' association, including such terms as financial soundness, good professional management and community harmony, all of which are reflected in the appearance of the area and in homeowner satisfaction.

•Important is the reputation of the builder-developer.

•Finally, the extent of seller confidence (and/or the confidence of the seller's agent) in the condominium lifestyle is often a critical factor.

## What qualifying at the bank is about

Unless you're part of a very small and prosperous minority, when it comes time to buy a home, you're going to have to finance a substantial portion of your purchase—and that means convincing a conventional lending source that you're capable of making a down payment and meeting a monthly obligation.

The name of the game at the lending institution, be it a bank or savings and loan, is qualifying—proving that you can afford the house you want to buy.

Bob Wissmuller explains the lending institutions' philosophy succinctly: "We're interested in loaning people money and getting it back. We're not in the real estate business—we don't want houses."

Wissmuller, an assistant loan officer at National Bank of Detroit in Plymouth, says most lending institutions use a common set of guidelines to judge applicants' financial capabilities.

"The first thing we have to know is what the purchase price of the home is, and how much of it is going to be mortgaged."

Often those are added to the monthly payments of the house to see if the total figure exceeds 25 per cent of the applicant's monthly household income.

According to Wissmuller, if the applicant meets the criteria to make a quick computation about the applicant's qualifications, Wissmuller says the bank is also interested in painting a complete picture of the applicant.

The lending institution will ask for personal data such as marital status, income, potential income, credit history, debt load, and present living location. To verify this information, the lending institution will generally go through three checks on the applicant, Wissmuller says.

• A credit check to see if the applicant is a good risk — whether previous debts were paid off promptly, and to check on the applicant's present debt load. This is done through a credit bureau.

• A deposit check to see if the applicant has enough money to meet the down payment and closing costs.

• An employment check to verify the applicant's place of employment and to check on income.

While the lending institution will use these two criteria to make a quick computation about the applicant's qualifications, Wissmuller says the bank is also interested in painting a complete picture of the applicant.

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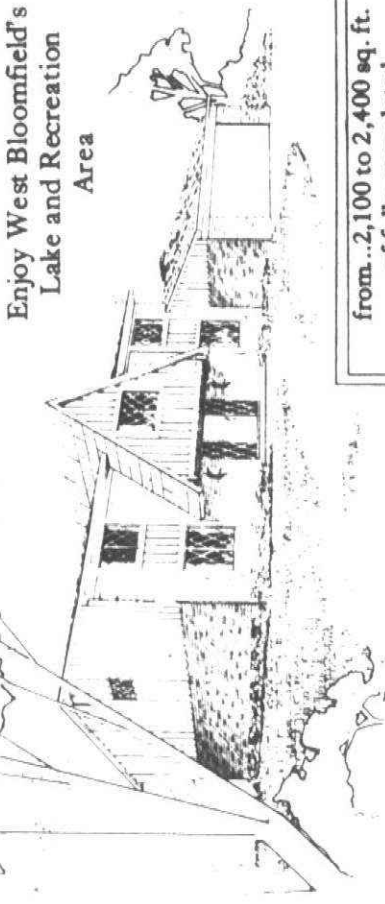

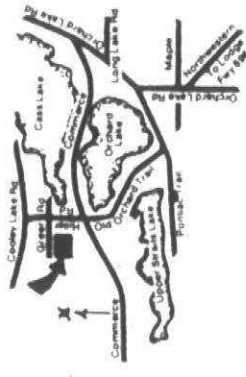

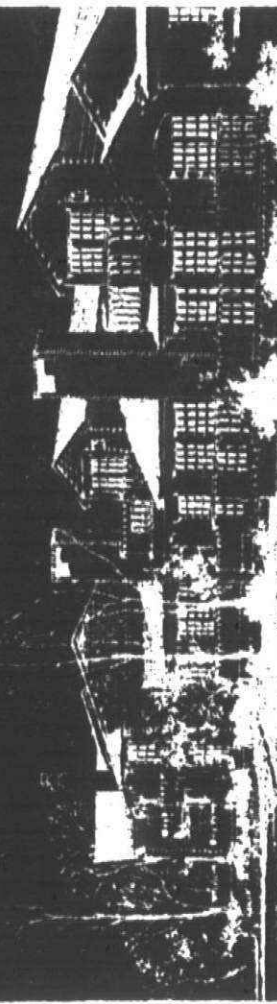

# Students make solar collector

It's amazing what you can do with a little help from a friend.

A group of students at Churchill High School in Livonia put their heads together last September to come up with a solution to the energy crisis. Their solution, a solar energy collector, is now getting its finishing touches in the physics department at the school.

It's no toy either—the collector will soon be put to use heating water for an entire household. And the builders are optimistic that it will be able to take on an even greater share of the household's energy needs.

Dr. Richard Braun, head of the physics department at Churchill, has been guiding the students along throughout their ambitious project, but he says the original idea, design and construction was done by them.

“We did a tremendous amount of research, and as far as we know the design is unique,” Braun said.

**THE COLLECTOR** is enclosed in a four-foot by eight-foot cabinet. Underneath its glass cover are rows of metal reflectors angled to catch the maximum amount of rays from the sun. The collector directs the rays onto 360 feet of copper tubing. The tubing is heated, warming the water flowing through it.

“The water may even

reach the boiling point. We're going to put a thermostat on the collector so we can monitor the temperature,” Braun says.

That means plenty of hot water for, and maybe even clothes, and maybe even boiling water to hook up to a generator that could provide enough energy for every appliance in the house.

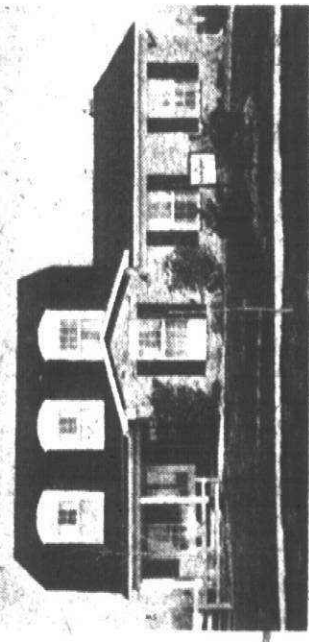
“We figure there will be a two-to-12 degree Fahrenheit temperature rise per square foot of solar area,” Braun said. The 32-square-foot collector has the potential of heating water up to 384 degrees above its original temperature. Because the boiling point of water is 212 degrees Fahrenheit, there are a lot of interesting possibilities for use of the collector with a generator.

Each student put about 100 hours of work into the amount of research, and as school as the CHASER project (for Churchill High Applied Solar Energy Research.)

Many students contributed their own special skills to the project. The students have offered to send anyone who sends a request to Churchill High School with a self-addressed, stamped envelope a copy of the plans.

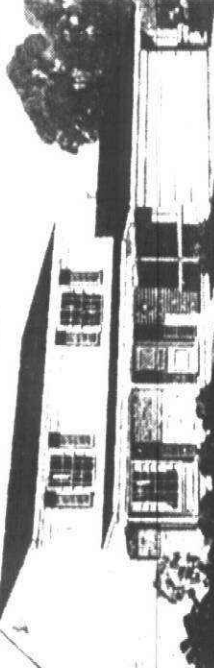

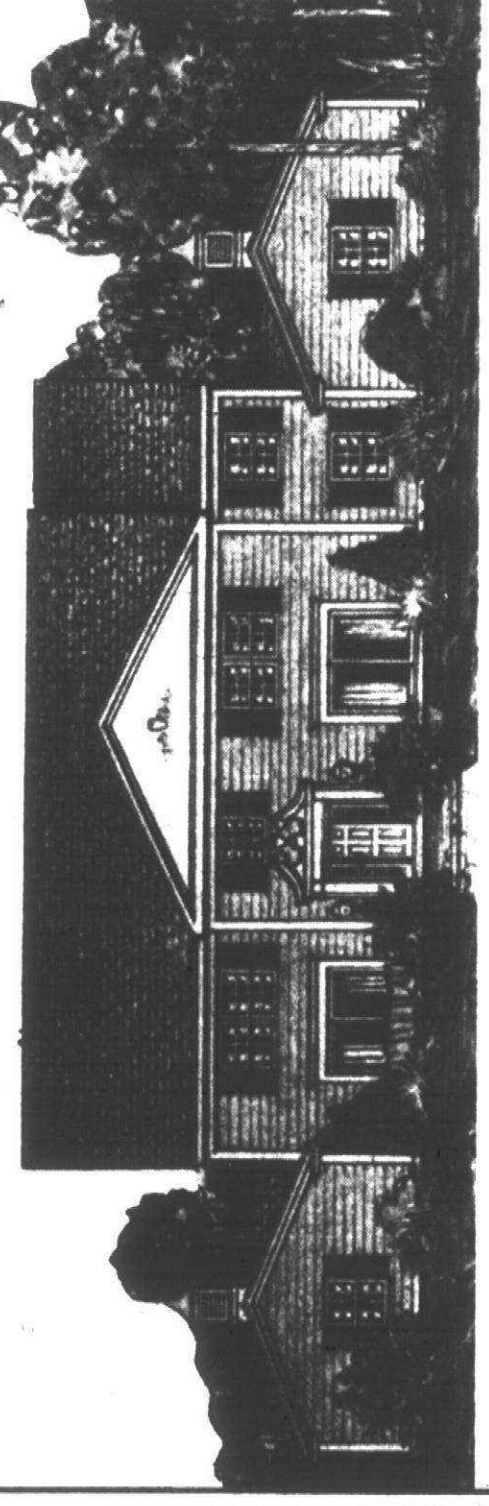

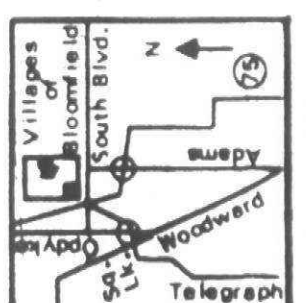

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# Plants, prints, boxes-decorating on a budget

Now that you've bought the house, how do you make it home?

While some individuals believe that the only affordable decor is early orange crates, there are alternatives to that rather rustic look.

The fabric, which will be used for pillows, curtains, and possibly, tablecloths, must be heavy duty. It doesn't all have to be only one design.

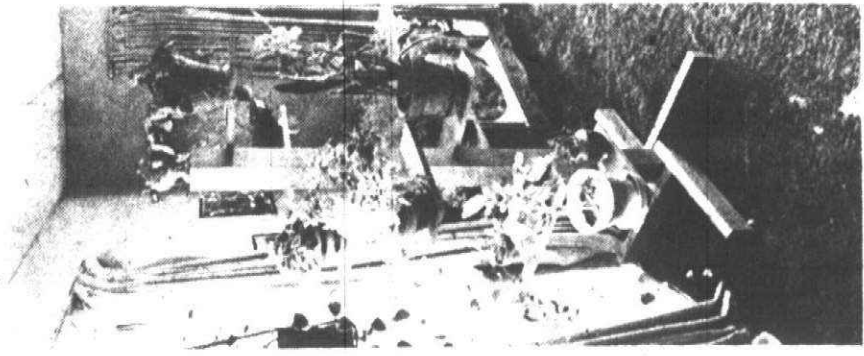
Prints and stripes, stripes and geometrics do mix and in fact, add interest to a room.

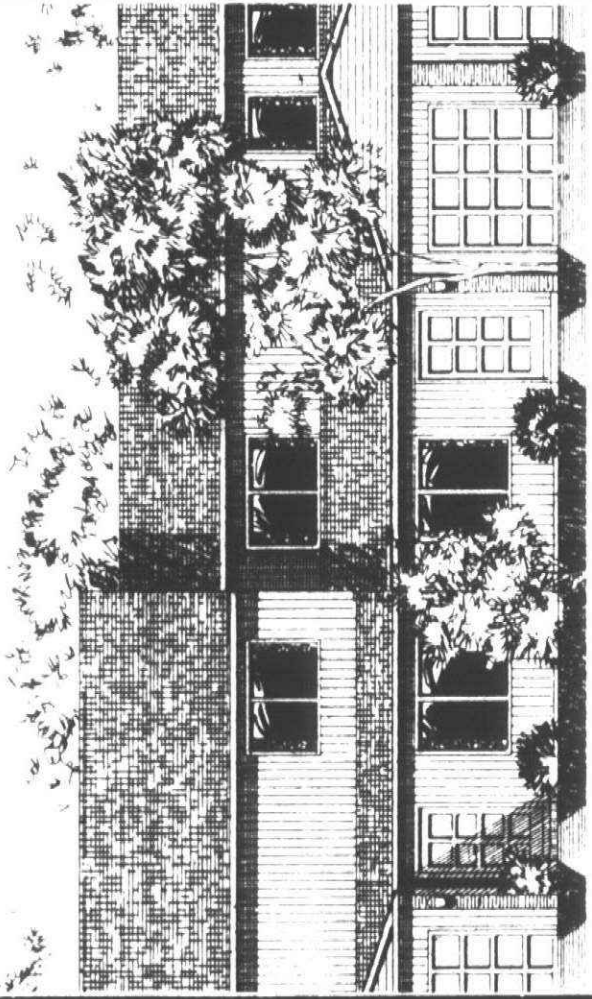

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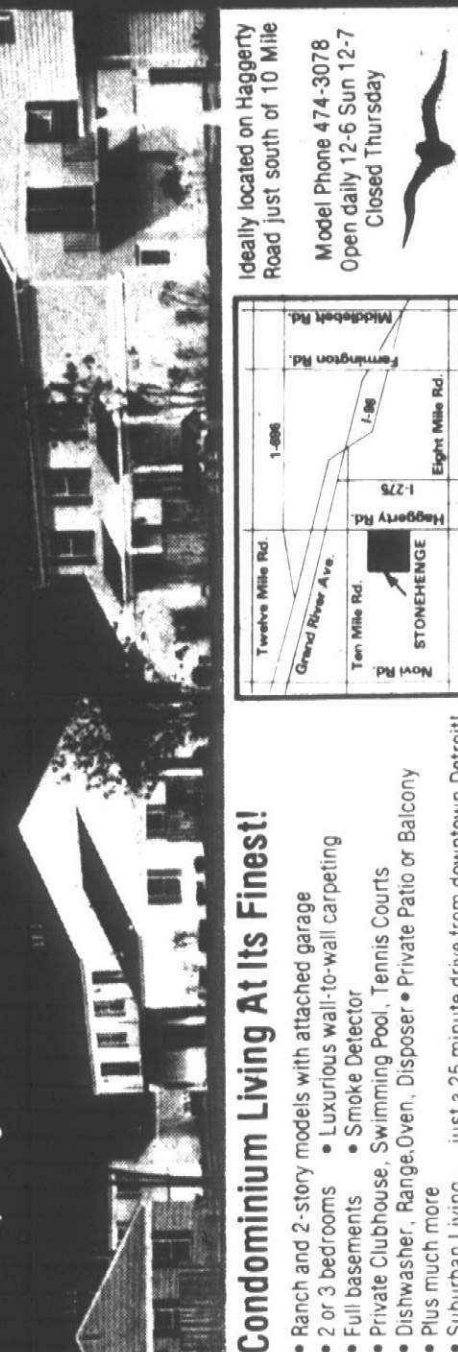
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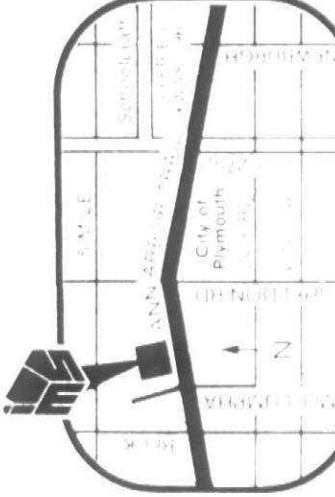

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# Try this if homes jargon is boggling

Most home buyers, particularly those involved in the process for the first time, find themselves faced with a wide range of unfamiliar terms and phrases.

The best way to cope with such situations is to "speak up," say members of the United Northwestern Realty Association (UNRA). If you don't fully understand a term or are not sure of its meaning, ask your real estate agent or loan officer for an explanation.

To assist prospective buyers, UNRA offers this alphabetized glossary of terms commonly encountered in arranging a home mortgage:

- Closing: The completion of a real estate transaction includes such things as the signing of mortgage documents, delivery of deed, disbursement of funds connected with the sale as well as other financial adjustments.
- Closing costs: Paid by the borrower at time of closing, these costs cover such things as origination fee, title insurance, survey, escrow payments, attorney fees and taxes.
- Commitment: This is an agreement to make a loan subject to certain stated conditions.

## Inflation hits homes

The cost of building homes rose an average of 33 per cent in the five years since 1972, and 6.7 per cent in the last year alone. This dismal report comes from the Detroit Board of Realtors.

Figures show a continuing rise in costs in all categories of building, starting with 1915. Since 1972, costs of a typical brick veneer or stucco house have risen from \$1.40 per cubic foot to \$2.03, or 32 per cent, in the last year from \$1.81 to \$2.03, or 6.7 per cent.

For frame construction of a house, the cubic foot cost was \$1.20 in 1972, \$1.56 in 1976 and \$1.75 as 1977 began, for a 38 per cent rise in five years and 7.8 per cent in the last year alone.

Cinder-concrete block construction showed the least cost rise, up from \$1.57 in 1972 to \$2.04 in 1976 and \$2.27 per cubic foot in 1977. The increase for block worked out at 28.4 per cent for the five years and 5.5 per cent for the last year.

•Escrow payment: This is the part of the monthly mortgage payment, beyond principal and interest, that is held in trust to pay for such things as taxes, mortgage insurance and hazard insurance. An annual accounting is provided and some adjusting may be required periodically to assure continued coverage of these items.

- FHA: The Federal Housing Administration is an agency of the federal government that insures mortgages meeting FHA standards and conditions.
- Fee simple: A reference to absolute and unconditional status of property ownership.
- GI loan: Also called a VA loan, this is a mortgage loan granted a qualified veteran that is guaranteed by the Veterans Administration.
- Hazard insurance: A usual requirement in granting home mortgage loans, this is insurance purchased against damage to the property from fire, wind and other hazards.
- Home mortgage loan: This is a long term loan pledging the property purchased as security. The three principal kinds are conventional, FHA and VA.
- Lien: This is a legal claim held on the property as security against a debt.
- Mortgage discount: Also called points, loan broker's age fee, or new loan fee, this is an equalizer in the mortgage field to make a loan acceptable to a lender.

Equal to one per cent of the mortgage amount, one point is roughly equivalent to 1% of one per cent in terms of interest yield. To get a lender to back an eight per cent VA or FHA loan when the market is 8 1/2 per cent, the yield must be increased 3/4 per cent by a cash payment. Sellers pay such charges as federal law prohibits charging points to FHA VA borrowers. However, lenders are allowed to charge such borrowers a one per cent origination fee.

•Note: This is a document acknowledging a debt and promising to pay it.

•Prepayment clause: Written into the mortgage agreement, this permits a borrower to repay a portion or the remainder of the

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# New energy code to affect architecture

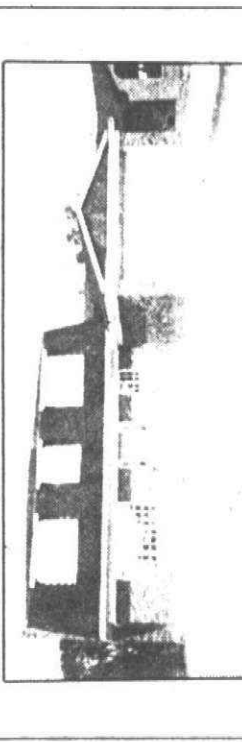
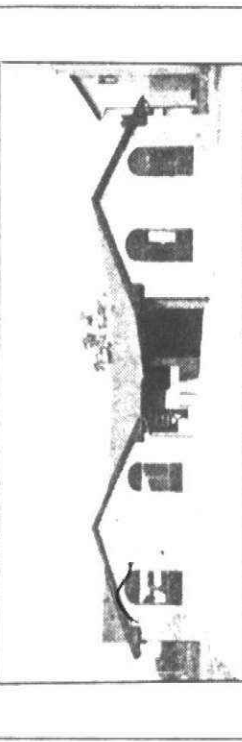
Michigan's new energy code, which goes into effect June 22, may well mean the end of cathedral ceilings and the broad, Florida-type glass areas often found in today's housing.

That is the reading of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan from preliminary information on application of the code to homes and other heated buildings, all of which are affected.

For home builders in the Detroit metropolitan area, where winter temperatures normally are moderate, the code will have its major effect in the tighter control over design and its effect on heat loss. Largely, homes being built here sing.

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THE MICHIGAN construction code authority currently is drafting a handbook outlining requirements in simple terms for building officials, design firms and Air Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE). 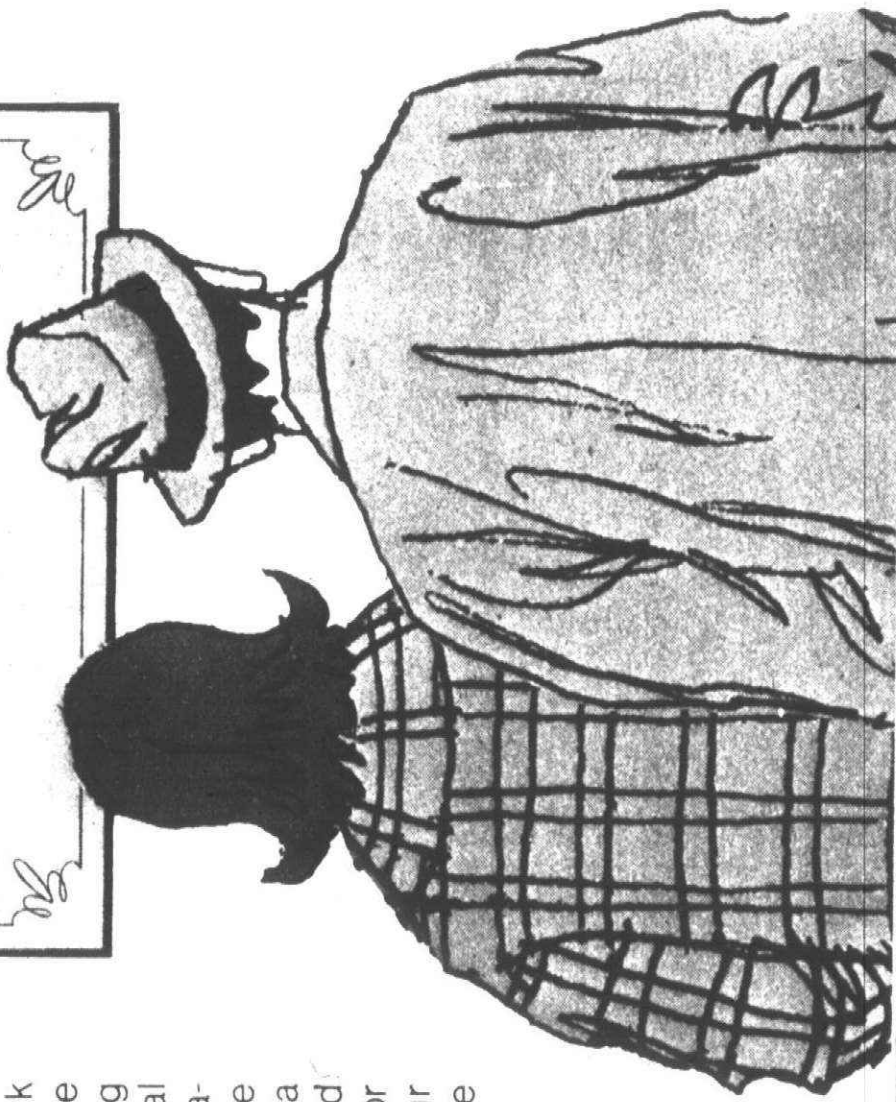

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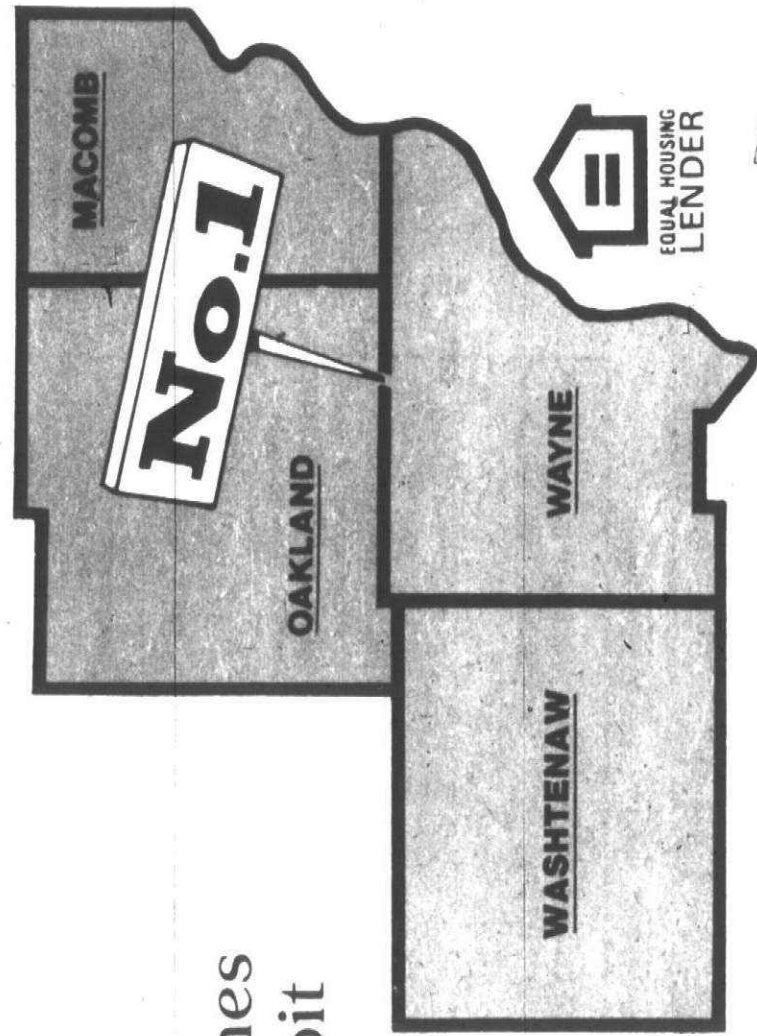
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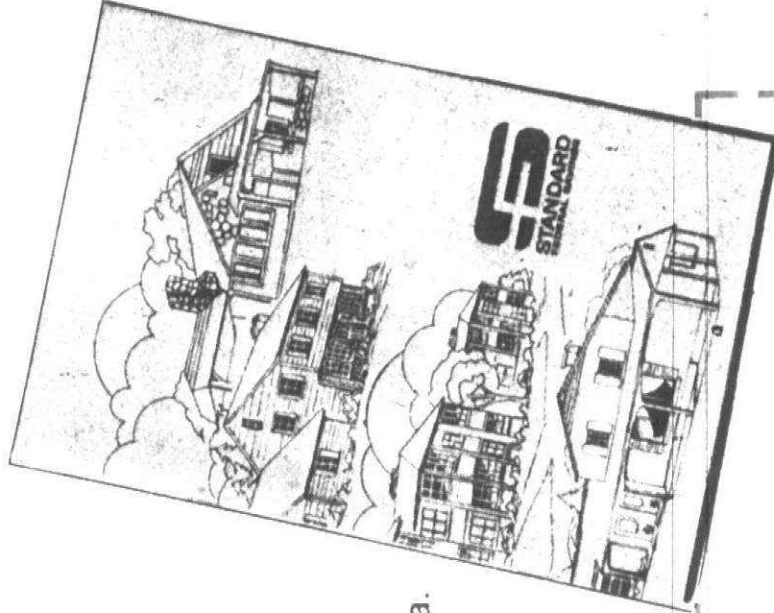
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
