

School boundary changes rile parents

After months of study and deliberation, the Plymouth Board of Education bit the bullet Monday and established attendance boundaries for the 1977-78 school year.

By a 4-0 vote, the trustees adopted the recommendations of the boundary committee, with changes suggested by Supt. John Hoben. Trustee Marcia Borowski and President Joe Grey were absent. Trustee Richard Arlen left the meeting moments before the vote.

In other action, the board unanimously voted to establish a districtwide appeals procedure to rule on individual complaints about school assignments for children.

The trustees who showed up—and stayed—to make the controversial

boundaries decision did so with the knowledge there was no way to please everyone in the district.

"We are what you call between a rock and a hard place on this one. My phone has been ringing off the hook for weeks," said E. J. McClendon during a break before the vote was taken.

School officials also said the board of education office has been deluged with calls from parents asking for special consideration for their particular situation.

Billie Whiteley, chairman of the boundary committee, told trustees the committee had attended every school in the district within the last several weeks, telling parents what the recommendations were and listening to com-

ments and complaints.

IN LAST MINUTE PLEAS, residents of Pickwick Village and Prestige Heights in Canton, as well as parents of Isbister children, petitioned the board to keep their concerns in mind in making a final decision.

The Canton parents told the board their children had been moved a number of times in the last four years, and said it was time they were given some permanence and stability. The Isbister parents said they had deep feelings for and ties with the school and asked to remain there.

The board members listened quietly to all comments, occasionally pointing out that rapid population growth made it impossible for any guaran-

tees to be handed out.

Prior to the vote, Trustee George Lawton told the audience that the concerns of the parents, administration, and the boundary committee had been weighed.

"There is some feeling in the community that the administration or board is rigid on the boundaries. We are not. This board and this administration is interested in providing every option possible."

He then moved to accept the boundary committee report with the following amendments:

- Students in Pickwick Village and Shilo will be assigned to Gallimore but can choose to attend Allen or Tanager.
- The residents of Pilgrim Hills will

be polled to find out if the majority want to attend either Geer or Gallimore. If the choice is Geer, Gallimore will be the option school; if Gallimore is chosen, Geer will be the option.

- The Gallimore attendance area will include all children west of Sheldon, north of Ford, east of Canton Center and south of Warren roads. Gallimore will be on a 45-15 schedule.

Although a number of parents expressed concern about bus transportation, the board remained firm in its decision that those parents who elect option schools have to provide their children with private transportation.

IN A LATER decision the board adopted a suggestion by Hoben to create a two-part appeals process for par-

ents who have a complaint about their child's school assignment.

Under the policy each school will have its own appeals panel, and there will be one districtwide appeals panel.

The school panels will be made up of the principal, a teacher, and a parent. The district panel will consist of the assistant superintendent for instruction, an elementary school principal, a middle school principal, an elementary school parent, a middle school parent, and someone from the pupil personnel department.

In making his recommendation, Hoben said the appeals panels recognize "that the 1977-78 school year will involve an unusual amount of change in school attendance boundaries and school calendar."

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Brian and Gregory get hall paving, sewer bids

Brian and Gregory construction company of Novi has been awarded two contracts for work to be done on the new township hall.

One contract is for sanitary sewer extension from Cherry Hill to the hall site at Canton Center and Proctor. The second contract is for a gravel road and parking lot. Eventually the road and lot will be paved.

Brian and Gregory was lowest bidder among five for the aggregate paving job and second lowest bidder on the sanitary sewer project.

The township's engineering consultants, Wade, Trim and Associates, recommended Brian and Gregory for the sewer job over the lowest bidder, Morelli Construction, which bid \$106,336.

Brian and Gregory bid the sewer job at a higher quote of \$111,516. Canton Clerk John Flodin explained that the firm has shown better workmanship than Morelli. Brian and Gregory also must meet federal hiring requirements.

The township board has hired R.E. Dailey Co. of Detroit to act as construction manager in building the hall. Canton will be, in effect, the contractor.

Canton has hired Ralls-Hamill Architects, Inc. as architect for the three-story \$2.7 million federally-funded administration building. Ralls Hamill and R.E. Dailey are also working on Livonia's federally-funded new administration building.

Ed Krynski, representative for R.E. Dailey, says the construction management firm has set up four steps for building at the new township hall.

"First we get the hole dug and the substructure laid," Krynski said. "That's what the two bids tonight were for. Next we will solicit bids among construction firms for the superstructure. Third step will be closing in the roof, installing windows and outside doors. The last stage is contracting people to paint, tile, carpet and make the finishing touches."

Each stage has been budgeted and if the various stages consistently come in under budget, Krynski said more inside work, such as room partitions, may be included.

Call it junk, call it antiques; it has to be gone this fall

Roger and Duane Bordine call it valuables. Canton Township calls it junk.

Whatever it is, the equipment now stored on the Bordines' Canton farmland must be sold or hidden from sight by next September, by order of 35th District Court Judge Dunbar Davis.

Ruling on the township's lawsuit against the Bordine brothers for allegedly breaking Canton's blight ordinance, Davis recently gave the Bordines until Sept. 7 to remove at least a portion of the equipment from their farm on Saltz, east of Ridge. The remainder, according to Davis, must be hidden from the road by a fence.

In a violation notice issued by the township last fall, the Bordines were charged with violating the blight ordinance by storing junk cars, inoperable machinery, wood remnants and metal scraps in plain view.

Under the blight ordinance, persons must store all inoperable equipment and vehicles in sheds or some other type of enclosure.

Although the Bordines recently pled no contest to the township's charges, Roger Bordine insists that valuable antiques are among the things the township calls "junk."

THE LONG-TIME Canton resident said he had planned to use the antique thrashing machines, tractors and other farming equipment to establish a "farm-type museum" someday.

But now Bordine says he'll probably have to forego those plans.

"We have stuff here that's been out here for years and years," he said. "Some of the things my great-grandfather had."

"I had definite plans for my retirement. I wanted to set up an old-type farm with horse-drawn equipment and rebuild the buildings to show how farms operated years ago. I had been looking forward to this for 30 years, but now I just don't know."

Bordine, who is considering selling his Canton farmland, said he could establish the farm "museum" elsewhere.

But for now, Bordine and his brother must sell at least a portion of the equipment stored on their land.

Bordine said he has already contacted a group of Amish families in western Michigan about the horse-

drawn carriages he has. The families are planning a summer trip to Canton to examine the equipment.

"In September, my land will look considerably different—or else I won't be here," the Canton farmer pledged.

Ford-Haggerty corner scheduled for widening

Canton property owners affected by a proposal to widen the Ford Road-Haggerty intersection should ask the Michigan State Highway Department for a public hearing on the matter by April 29 if they object to the highway department's plans.

The proposed project calls for construction of an additional lane on westbound Ford from Haggerty to I-275; widening of Ford to five lanes immediately west of Haggerty; and widening of Haggerty to five lanes immediately north and south of Ford.

According to Phil Chisholm, public hearings coordinator for the highway department, work on the project should begin sometime next March with completion scheduled for fall of 1978.

But before beginning work on the

project, the highway department must acquire various pieces of property for the right-of-way.

The road improvement project requires 27-foot-wide strips of land on the north and south sides of Ford, extending about 700 feet west of Haggerty; and 27-foot-wide strips on the east and west sides of Haggerty, extending about 460 feet north from Ford.

Persons objecting to the proposal should mail a written request for a public hearing to Jack E. Morgan, Public Involvement Section, Michigan Department of State Highways and Transportation, State Highways Building, P.O. Box 30050, Lansing 48909. Calling all cops for police chief position

Through the end of April, Canton Township officials will be accepting applications and resumes from persons who would like to become full-time chief of police for Canton's part-time department.

Applications will be examined first by the township's three-member police commission, consisting of Clerk John Flodin and trustees Brian

Schwall and Eugene Daley. Persons passing preliminary screening will be referred to the Michigan Municipal League for interviews and final selection. Canton will pay for the selection process.

Due April 30, the applications should be from persons with a minimum of five years experience in police administration, who hold certified

police officer diplomas and intend to reside in Canton.

Starting salary is advertised at \$21,000, "with liberal township fringe benefits." Members of the township board also indicated that they would look favorably on someone with experience in securing federal funds from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration. (LEAA).

A TWO-PAGE list of requirements for the job and desired qualifications may be obtained at the township hall, 44508 Geddes Road.

"We want the whole world to know we're accepting applications for the police chief job," Flodin said.

The applications should be accompanied by a brief personal resume.

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Tap SEMTAP

How to save energy and money

Energy usage can be reduced to save significant amounts of money for homeowners and merchants without any large investments of money.

That was the encouraging word given by Ervin Sattinger to those attending the monthly luncheon meeting of the Plymouth Community Chamber of Commerce in the Miles Standish Room of the Mayflower Hotel.

Sattinger is a staff member of the Environment Institute of Michigan which is currently working closely with the Southeastern Michigan Technical Assistance Program (SEMTAP).

During his talk, Sattinger said some energy saving measures require large capital investments and shouldn't be instituted without a careful cost-benefit analysis. But many things can be done free or at little expense, he stressed, to reduce energy costs in the home and in business. He also outlined what SEMTAP is and its relationship to Schoolcraft College in this area.

SEMTAP WAS STARTED a few months ago by the state in cooperation with ten community colleges, including Schoolcraft, Wayne County Community College and Henry Ford Community College.

SEMTAP has been set up to help local people with energy conservation or other technical problems associated with their businesses, industries, governments, and even individual homes.

The colleges' role in the program is to help convey, upon request, the large amount of technological information now available.

Local residents or groups can visit the office of Ron Griffin, in the community service office on the Schoolcraft campus. He will answer questions and provide advice on how to solve anyone's particular problem.

Persons visiting a SEMTAP office might be put in touch with other scientific clearing houses or told to write to the National Technical Information Service.

AFTER URGING LISTENERS to take advantage of the new SEMTAP service, Sattinger gave some hints of his own.

"I think now after two energy scares—the Arab oil embargo of 1973 and this year's natural gas shortage—the public is aware we are faced with a serious energy crisis. Probably the major key to supply shortages is conservation," he told his listeners.

"The important thing to remember is some things can be done which don't cost money. It doesn't cost anything to turn off a light switch or dial down a thermostat. There may be a loss of comfort, but there's no money spent."

Residential and commercial firms account for about one-third of the total energy used in the nation, he stated. Of this amount, some 53 per cent is used for space heating, 12 per cent for the water heater, and eight per cent for air-conditioning.

The real opportunity to reduce energy usage is in the areas of space heating, air conditioning, and lighting, Sattinger said.

"Take the dialing down program we've all heard about. It doesn't cost you any money to set the thermostat down to 68. And for every degree reduced, you save three per cent of the energy used for space heating. One building of 50,000 square feet dialed down from 68 to 58 on evenings, weekends and holidays and reduced its space heating bill by 13 per cent."

Weatherstripping and caulking to prevent heat loss along with use of drapes and shades to keep out the sun, were other methods Sattinger suggested to use against the extreme Michigan seasons.

"And don't overlook the efficiency of deciduous trees. In the summer the leaves provide shade to reduce the heat coming into the home. In winter, after the leaves drop off, the trees allow the heat to come through."

Storm windows and thermo windows also are very important, Sattinger pointed out.

Wall and ceiling insulation can pay for itself in a very short time, he added. Wall insulation can pay for itself in seven years and ceiling insulation in five years.

The Environment Institute of Michigan staff member finished his talk with a prediction.

"One thing people may not realize is how much gas is consumed by pilot

lights. The gasoline burned by pilot lights in the average home accounts for three per cent of the total gas bill. For gas ranges, 30 per cent of the gas

the stove uses is for the pilot. Because of this, we may in the future see gas pilots replaced with electronic ignition systems."

Vice-chairwoman seeks new SC term

Rosina Raymond, vice-chairwoman of the Schoolcraft College board, will seek a new six-year term as a trustee in the June 13 election.

Her campaign will emphasize her involvement with the college from the planning stages 16 years ago and the recent emphasis on career programs and community services.

Mrs. Raymond of 15906 Oak Drive, Livonia, is a part time speech instructor at Wayne State University, a genealogy instructor in the Livonia community education division, and a former teacher in the Livonia school district and at Madonna College.

ELECTED TO the board after the 1971 reapportionment, Mrs. Raymond wants to seek further progress "in the direction of earn-while-you-learn."

"During that period, we have greatly facilitated our career programs, expanding especially the vocational-technical aspects, and broadened the transfer curricula.

"Community services, which includes the establishment and operation of the resource center, have been accelerated. I feel we are truly a community college."

AS A SCHOOLCRAFT trustee, Mrs. Raymond has been vice-chairwoman for four years, currently is acting delegate to the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments and is a newly elected member of the SEMCOG executive committee.

She shares the latter distinction with her husband, Jerry, a Livonia councilman and member of SEMCOG's inner circle.

She co-chaired the first millage committee in 1962 for the college and worked on the organizing committee in 1961.

Her other activities include: president of the Livonia Municipal Library Commission; vice-president of the Livonia Historical Society; member and

past president of the Livonia Business and Professional Women and past president of the Detroit Society for Genealogical Research Inc.

Mrs. Raymond was 1974 woman of the year for Soroptimist International of Livonia and 1976 achievement award winner statewide for the Jackson Business and Professional Women's Club.

Sewer rates hiked by Wayne County

The county has hiked Plymouth Township's sewer rates by about \$19 per million gallons of water, but residents won't notice the increase.

George Bingham, director of the county board of public works, notified the township board of trustees Tuesday that the new sewer rate is \$159.48 per million gallons. It was \$140.96. The increase in cost is retroactive to Jan. 1.

According to Web Kincade, water and sewer department superintendent, that means residents would have to pay approximately two cents more for every thousand gallons of water they used.

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MacDiarmid is reluctant hero

The man was unquestionably proud of the honor, yet Ptl. John MacDiarmid still acted a little bit uncomfortable in the hero's role.

For his decisive action in saving the life of five-year-old Michael Arzadon, MacDiarmid received two governmental proclamations of appreciation at Tuesday night's township board meeting. One award came from the county, the other was from Canton.

On Sunday, April 3, MacDiarmid left the regular search party and found Michael floating face-down in five feet of water almost half a mile downstream from his home in Tamarack Apartments. Police estimate the boy was in the water for approx-

imately 12 minutes before being pulled out.

Both awards bore gold seals and were replete with heartfelt, bureaucratic whereases.

The commendation from the county, signed by Commissioners Royce Smith and John Barr, states: "Whereas, MacDiarmid, a 23-year-old member of Canton's part-time police force and father of two children, heard a call for help made to the Wayne County Sheriff Department. Whereas, exercising great composure, presence of mind and leadership and split-second timing in the midst of potential tragedy, John MacDiarmid raced downstream with another officer, and, upon seeing the boy floating face-down in the middle of the river, dove

in the frigid water, pulled him out and began giving him life-saving resuscitation."

The closing remarks of the proclamation read: "Recognizing there is no greater accomplishment in any man's life than that of saving another human life, we hereby commend John MacDiarmid for his heroic and selfless effort which serves as the finest example of human kindness for all of us."

THE RESCUED BOY, Michael, is listed in fair condition at Wayne County General Hospital where he has been since the near-tragedy. Michael is conscious, but his parents say his progress has stopped because of what they feel is "a mental block" caused

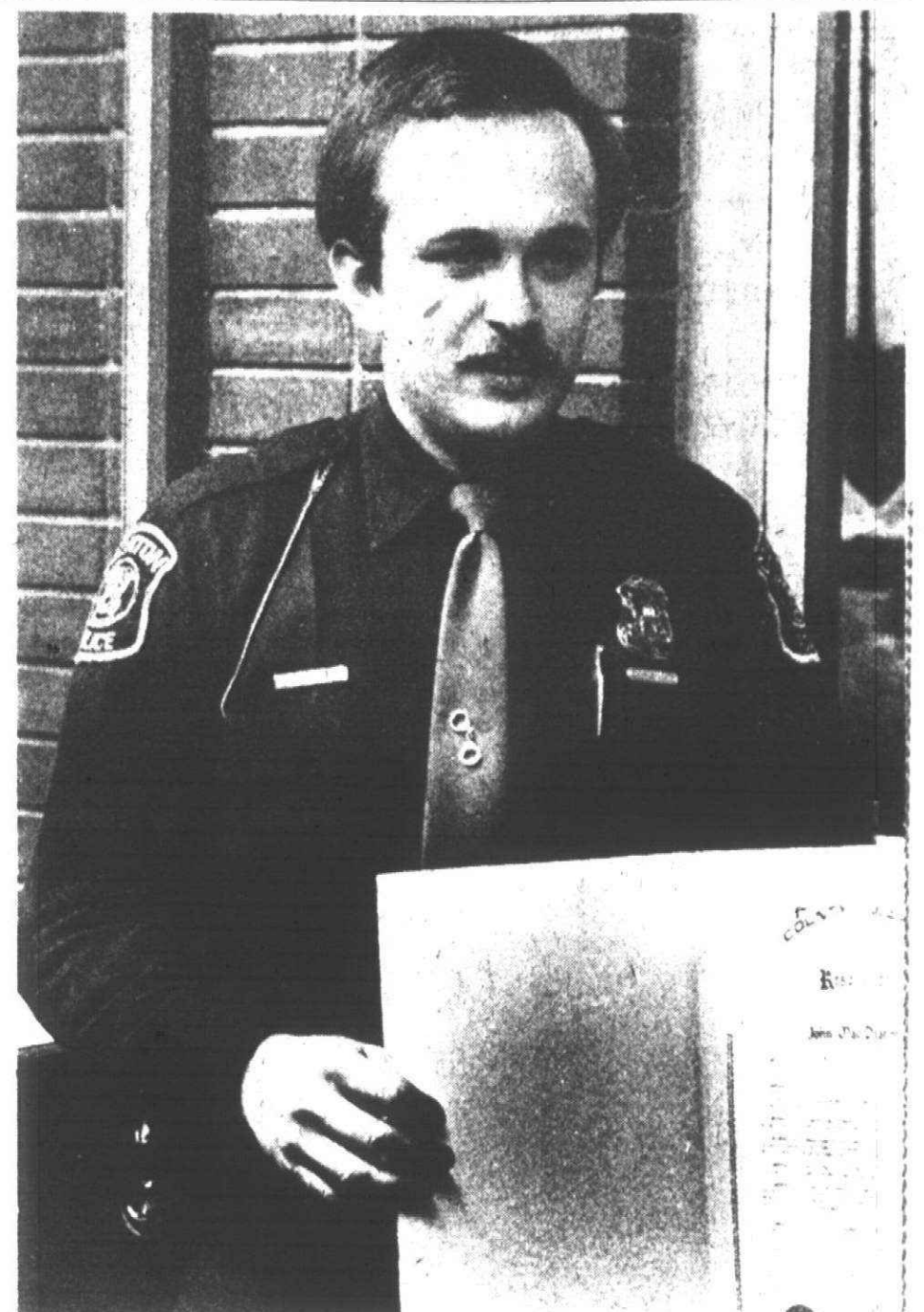
by trauma. Michael has not been able to talk since the incident.

Kathy and Robert Arzadon say their son's doctors report his lack of speech could be caused by trauma, brain damage, or the possibility that vocal cords were damaged when oxygen tubes were inserted down the boy's throat.

The couple hopes Michael didn't suffer permanent brain damage when he was deprived of oxygen while under water.

The Arzadons showed up Tuesday for the award ceremony and privately thanked MacDiarmid again for his part in the rescue effort.

Poster child very blase about hobnobbing with celebrities

Television appearances with rock star Bob Seger and pitcher Mark Fidrych are only a small part of Canton toddler Debbie Ott's busy day.

As the March of Dimes' new poster child for metropolitan Detroit, and a victim of the birth defect spina bifida, 2½-year-old Debbie is suddenly the

star of posters, billboards and television commercials.

But, to Debbie, playing with her pet mice and sister Jennifer is still more interesting than encounters with celebrities.

"I DON'T THINK the publicity has really affected her or us at all," confessed Mrs. Kathy Ott, as Debbie chat-

tered in delight to a pet mouse and watched it scurry through a plastic maze toward a handful of food.

"She's really pretty good about it. She cried at the first event she had to appear at, but now she smiles for the camera all the time."

Since her selection as poster child last December, Debbie has appeared on posters and billboards throughout the Detroit metropolitan area with her leg braces and walker.

She's appeared on television commercials with Seger and "the Bird," and received a key to the City of Detroit last January. She's booked for appearances at all events planned by the March of Dimes.

The Canton toddler was chosen as the March of Dimes' poster child at a Christmas party sponsored by the Spina Bifida Association of Michigan. The request to have Debbie appear on television and the March of Dimes' posters came as a complete surprise.

"The head of the Detroit chapter of the March of Dimes was there," Mrs. Ott recalled, "and he just asked us if we'd let Debbie be the poster child. I just think they wanted certain things in a poster child, and she just fitted the bill."

Mrs. Ott attributes her daughter's selection as poster child to her personality, talking ability and young age. The last poster child began her five-year career with the March of Dimes at age 4, and Debbie is now 2½.

AS A VICTIM of spina bifida, one of the numerous birth defects the March of Dimes raises money for, Debbie is

unable to walk without the aid of leg braces and a walker. She has no control over her bladder or bowels, and a valve, surgically inserted in her head, drains spinal fluid from her brain.

Mrs. Ott said she knew something was wrong with Debbie the moment she was born. A lump the size of a walnut protruded from the infant's back—a telltale sign of the defective spinal cord that causes weakness in the legs. The lump was surgically removed shortly after birth, but symptoms of the birth defect remained.

Although no cure for spina bifida is known, doctors do know why symptoms of the birth defect occur. During the first month of pregnancy, the fetus fails to form a tube of nerve fibers around the spinal cord. A deficiency of nerve fibers to the muscles short-circuits impulses to the brain, causing weakness or even total paralysis of the legs.

Like Debbie, about 75 per cent of the children who have spina bifida have hydrocephalus or "water" on the brain. Although the condition formerly resulted in brain damage or death, surgical implantation of a valve in the child's head now prevents those dangers.

"I had never heard of spina bifida before," said Mrs. Ott, as Debbie scurried around the room in her walker. "But there still are worse things in the world. At least she still has her mind and her eyesight."

"I only hope this publicity helps other people realize that handicapped people are a part of the world."

Gallimore to go on 45-15 set-up

In a reversal of its prior decision, the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education Monday designated Gallimore Elementary School instead of Hulsing be placed on an extended school year (45-15) schedule for 1977-78.

In addition, the Gallimore attendance area now includes everything west of Sheldon, north of Ford, south of Warren, and east of Canton Center roads.

Hulsing School, which was originally slated for 45-15, will remain on a traditional nine-month calendar for at least one more year.

Parents in the Gallimore area who do not want their children to attend classes on a year-round basis can elect to send them to Tanger Elementary, which will operate on a traditional schedule.

School officials said Gallimore was selected to begin 45-15 because it is handling the largest amount of growth in student population, while Hulsing's population appears to have reached a plateau for the time being.

Other schools which will begin an extended calendar this year are: Eriksson, Field and Isbister elementaries, and Pioneer Middle School. They will be joining Miller School, which has been on a pilot 45-15 program for the last two years.

All 45-15 schools have been paired with traditional nine-month schools, and parents may elect to send their children to them as long as space is available.

Here's how reps. voted on assassination bill

Area congressmen were 4-1 in favor of the U.S. House vote March 30 to continue its special assassination committee.

The full house vote of 230-181 means the controversial committee will be funded for the rest of the current house term. It will investigate the assassinations of President John F. Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The only area congressman opposing the move was Rep. William D. Ford (D-Taylor), whose 15th district includes Garden City, Westland and Canton Township. Ford could not be reached for comment.

Rep. William Broomfield (R-Bloomfield) did not vote.

Rep. William Brodhead (D-Detroit), who voted in favor of the committee, said, "The main factor in my thinking

was that a recent national poll showed 80 per cent of the American people believe the full truth about the assassinations has not been told."

"If we have doubts, then an additional investigation is warranted," said Brodhead, whose 17th district includes Redford, Farmington and Southfield.

Said Rep. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), "Initially in January when there was a renewal motion, the committee asked for \$13 million for two years and to use unlimited bugging devices. I voted against that because I felt the money was unwarranted and the use of bugging devices would be unconstitutional."

"However, I voted in favor of the second request for an extension because they came back to earth and are now asking for a \$2.8 million budget per year, and no electronic surveillance or wire tapping is allowed," he said.

Pursell, whose 2nd district includes

Livonia and Plymouth, also said he changed his vote because the committee has recently been restructured and they had gotten rid of what he called "disruptive influences."

Pursell referred to the disruptive spat between the committee's chief counsel, Richard Sprague, and the first committee chairman, Rep. Henry Gonzalez, (D-Tex.)

Sprague resigned March 29, apparently agreeing with committee members who felt extension approval by the full house hinged on Sprague's removal. Sprague had been involved in a power struggle with Gonzalez, who resigned during the fight. The new committee chairman is Louis Stokes, D-Ohio.

Rep. David Bonior (D-Mt. Clemens), whose 12th District includes eastern Rochester, also voted for extending the committee's life.

"I didn't feel they had a chance to get started because of the internal

problems, Bonior explained. "Since Sprague and Gonzalez both resigned and the budget has been trimmed over 100 percent, I feel we ought to give the committee a chance to perform."

"There is some evidence surfacing with respect to the King and Kennedy assassinations that I think should be pursued further. If we don't pursue it, it will signal a whitewash by congress to the American people," he said.

"I SINCERELY believe the previous investigations of the two assassinations were not complete. I think we ought to have a more thorough investigation," said Rep. James Blanchard (D-18th Ferndale), whose 18th District includes Troy.

"When you have people in congress who are willing to spend two years pursuing a thorough review and in-

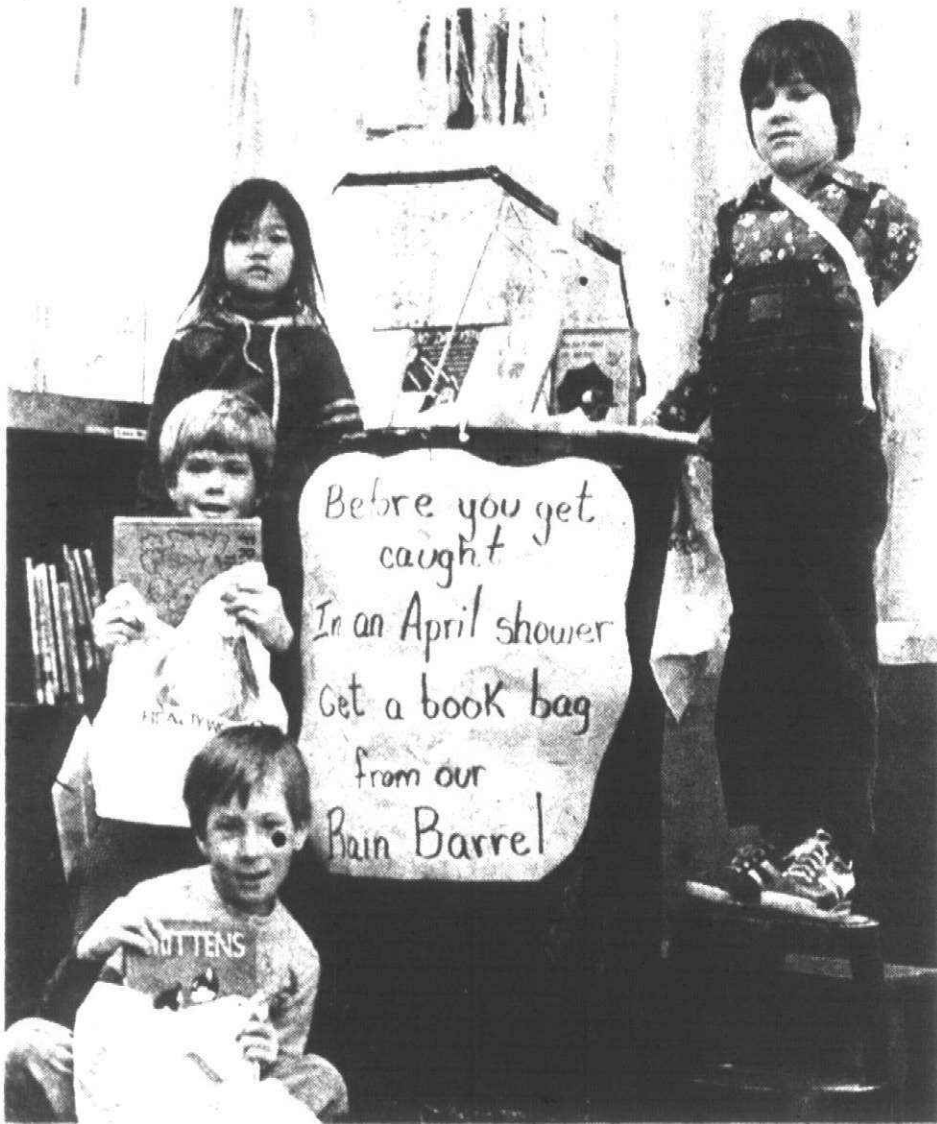
vestigation, the least I can do is support them," he said.

But even though these four area congressmen felt the committee should be extended, they still doubt whether the investigation will unearth any new facts.

"I don't think there is a likelihood that the committee will be successful, but I couldn't bring myself to close the door on them," said Rep. Brodhead. "I hope they're successful," he added.

"I'm concerned at this late date that it will be far more difficult to obtain competent evidence than in the early 60's," said Rep. Blanchard.

Along the same lines, Rep. Pursell said he also had some reservations about obtaining good witnesses after 13 years. "It seems difficult but the prosecutors feel that can be done properly," he said.

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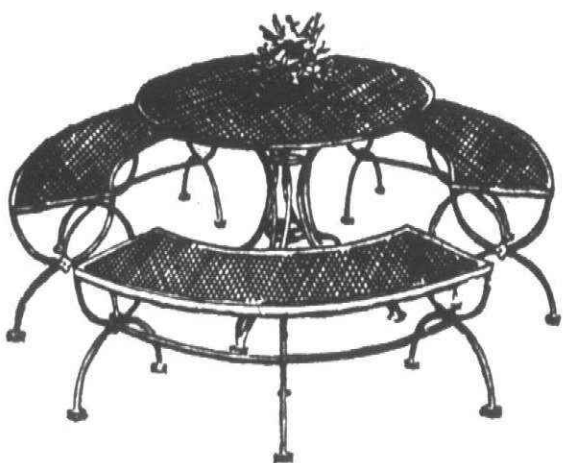
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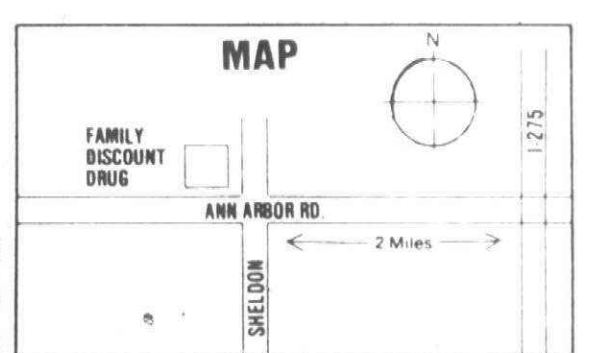
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The Stroller

Baseball boomerang

Sitting in the newly rebuilt press box at Tiger Stadium the other afternoon waiting for the start of another major league season, The Stroller couldn't help recalling his first visit 54 years ago when one had to master a catwalk to get to his place in the working area.

But as he sat there, peering down through unbreakable glass as the players warmed up, the memory of that first appearance at what was then Navin Field came rolling through the years and it seemed like only yesterday that he got the surprise of his life when the game started.

You see, prior to coming to Detroit to begin his career on a major newspaper, The Stroller had tried his hand at managing a baseball team, known as the Catasauqua Reds. Our team was the first in the area to wear red uniforms and we were respected as the "hottest" team in the Lehigh Valley.

There was only one team in the entire valley that furnished any kind of real competition. That was the Northampton team, representing the borough just a few miles up the valley. Because of this rivalry, we met on July 4 of each year—and what games they were!

On this particular renewal of the rivalry, The Stroller got a brilliant idea. If he could get the townspeople to contribute to a fund he could employ an all-star battery—a pitcher and catcher—that would overpower the "Konkrete Kids" as the Northampton team was called because it was the home of the Atlas Cement Co. the world's largest manufacturer of cement.

There was no trouble collecting a

sizeable sum for every man, woman and child would be pulling for a victory in the big game of year.

Fortified with the necessary cash, The Stroller journeyed down to Lafayette College in search of his all-star battery. Much to his surprise the star pitcher who had helped bring Lafayette the eastern college title quickly agreed to pitch for us. And he also got a catcher whom he claimed would help a lot.

Now the stage was set for one of the biggest surprises of the baseball season. It so happened that the game was to be played on the Northampton Field and a series of special trolley cars carried the fans and followers to the battle scene.

Not to take any chances with our plan being exposed, we met the college pitcher, a fellow who took the name of "Dank" and his catcher, a fellow named "Musselman" to Northampton early on the morning of the game and had them get into uniform in a friend's home rather than at the ball park.

No manager was more confident of victory than The Stroller was on that hot July 4 afternoon. To him, it seemed just a matter of going through the motions to prepare for a big celebration.

But, as often has been said, the best laid plans of mice and men go wrong. The Stroller got the shock of his life when he so proudly entered the ball park where the crowd had overflowed the stands.

As he went through the gate and headed for the visitor's dugout he noticed a familiar sight on the opposite

walked over to the "enemy" side. Sure enough it was a familiar sight. It was Charlie Berry, also of Lafayette College, who later became a star in the major leagues.

"What are you doing here?" The Stroller asked in surprise.

"I got a chance to pick up a couple bucks," he said.

"I am going to catch for Northampton today."

Stunned, The Stroller went back to the bench to await the start, and he heard the batteries announced. "And for Northampton, Clint Brown will pitch and Charlie Berry will catch."

This was the start of a bad afternoon as Clint Brown gave our lads only two hits and shut us out, 3-0.

That ended The Stroller's career as a manager, but it wasn't the last he thought of it.

By the time the next season rolled around, The Stroller was in Detroit. As a member of the Free Press sports staff he was assigned to do a

feature story on the Tigers' opener. Thrilled at the thought of being a big time sports writer, he anxiously travelled the catwalk to the press box and took his seat high above the playing field.

From that perch, he watched the Cleveland team go through its pregame practice. And he noticed particularly a bow-legged pitcher warming up.

You can imagine The Stroller's thought when the opening batteries were announced and the voice said, "For Cleveland, Clint Brown will pitch." The Stroller didn't wait to hear the catcher's name.

And would you believe it, this same Clint Brown gave the Tigers only a couple of hits and beat them on opening day.

Is it any wonder The Stroller's memories came rolling back a half century as he sat in the new press box a week ago to watch the Tigers open their 1977 season?

BUT THERE is another aspect to the story that everyone is ignoring, Mrs. Arzadon claims.

The couple has hired a legal investigator named Ronald Anderson to explore their theory that Michael was pushed into the river "which he was afraid to go near."

While admitting that she left her youngster in the rear yard while she went inside to iron, Mrs. Arzadon speculates that a 6-year-old neighbor boy pushed her son into the river or knows who did.

Mrs. Arzadon criticizes the investigation conducted by Wayne County Sheriff Det. Frank Harvey which concluded there was "no evidence of foul play" in the near-drowning.

"I know I should be thankful the boy's alive," said Mrs. Arzadon. "But I'm not thankful he was pushed in."

Somebody's keeping their mouth shut. Isn't it natural for a mother to want to know what really happened and not wonder?

Det. Harvey says he talked to the 6-year-old boy who Mrs. Arzadon suspects "knows something" and "was satisfied there was no foul play on the part of the child. However, Mrs. Arzadon accuses me of trying to whitewash the incident."

Mrs. Arzadon made a point of emphasizing the fact that both Det. Harvey and the 6-year-old are black.

"Until I have the opportunity to interview the Arzadon child, my case is closed," Det. Harvey said. "No one else was present."

"The two children were playing in a very unsafe area, and, on top of that, were unsupervised."

\$10 million is held back if bond issue is passed

If the \$29½ million bond issue is approved by Plymouth-Canton voters April 23, only \$19¼ million will be borrowed this year.

Of the total bond issue, \$10 million will be held in abeyance for two or three years before qualified for sale by the state.

The Michigan Department of Education wants to make sure that the entire \$29½ million is needed to accommodate growth in Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

To avoid the danger of overbuilding, the state has given permission for the school district to borrow \$19¼ million immediately if voters approve the issue. The school district must then go back to the state for approval before it can sell the remaining \$10 million.

"We will wait and see if the student enrollment growth continues as now projected," says Supt. John M. Hoben. "and to determine the impact extended school year has on the district's classroom space and the availability of classrooms in surrounding districts which may become available in the next two or three years."

"The sale of Series II (\$10 million) will depend on these variables."

SERIES I (\$19¼ million) will provide funds for the following:

Hines biking days set

Western Wayne County bicyclists can look forward to another four days of biking on the Hines Drive this summer and fall without having to buck auto traffic.

The Livonia city council last week approved State Rep. Robert Law's request to authorize the closing of the drive to car traffic for the four Saturdays.

The dates, to be confirmed by the Wayne County Road Commission and other commu-

nities in which the drive is located, are May 14, June 11, Sept. 10, and Oct. 8.

As in past years, the drive will be open only to bikers from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. from Ford Road in Dearborn to Haggerty in Plymouth.

The bike days were initiated several years ago by State Rep. John Markes, who represented the 36th House District in Westland and Livonia before defeated by Law last Nov. 2.

Three new elementary schools, pedestrian overpass on Warren Road, one new middle school, a number of remodeling and rehabilitation projects, portable classrooms for district-wide use, a six-classroom addition to Gallimore Elementary, construction or purchase of a warehouse-media center, purchase of a school site, and various professional fees related to construction.

Projects as part in Series II include: two new elementary schools, one new middle school, purchase of a school site, and construction fees.

The five elementary schools and two middle schools to be built will provide space for 5,528 additional students. The district anticipates 5,500 more students by 1982.

Each elementary is expected to cost slightly under \$2 million with the middle schools running about \$4.8 million.

Funds for new buildings total \$23 million with almost \$7 million allocated for renovation of existing school buildings.

Court enjoins local firm

Workers at Glassline Products Inc. have finally caught up with their overtime pay.

U.S. District Judge Philip Pratt recently ordered the Plymouth firm to cough up \$5,500 in back pay the court said the company owed 19 employees.

In addition, the court also granted the U.S. Department of Labor a permanent injunction prohibiting the firm from further overtime pay and record-keeping violations of the Fair

Labor Standards Act—the federal wage-hour law.

The labor department, which filed the original complaint, charged that Glassline repeatedly failed to pay employees time and-a-half for overtime. The department also said the company kept inadequate records of employee wages and hours.

The complaint followed an investigation by the labor department's wage-hour division, located at 231 W. Lafayette St., Detroit.

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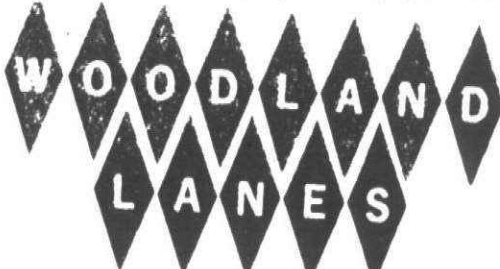

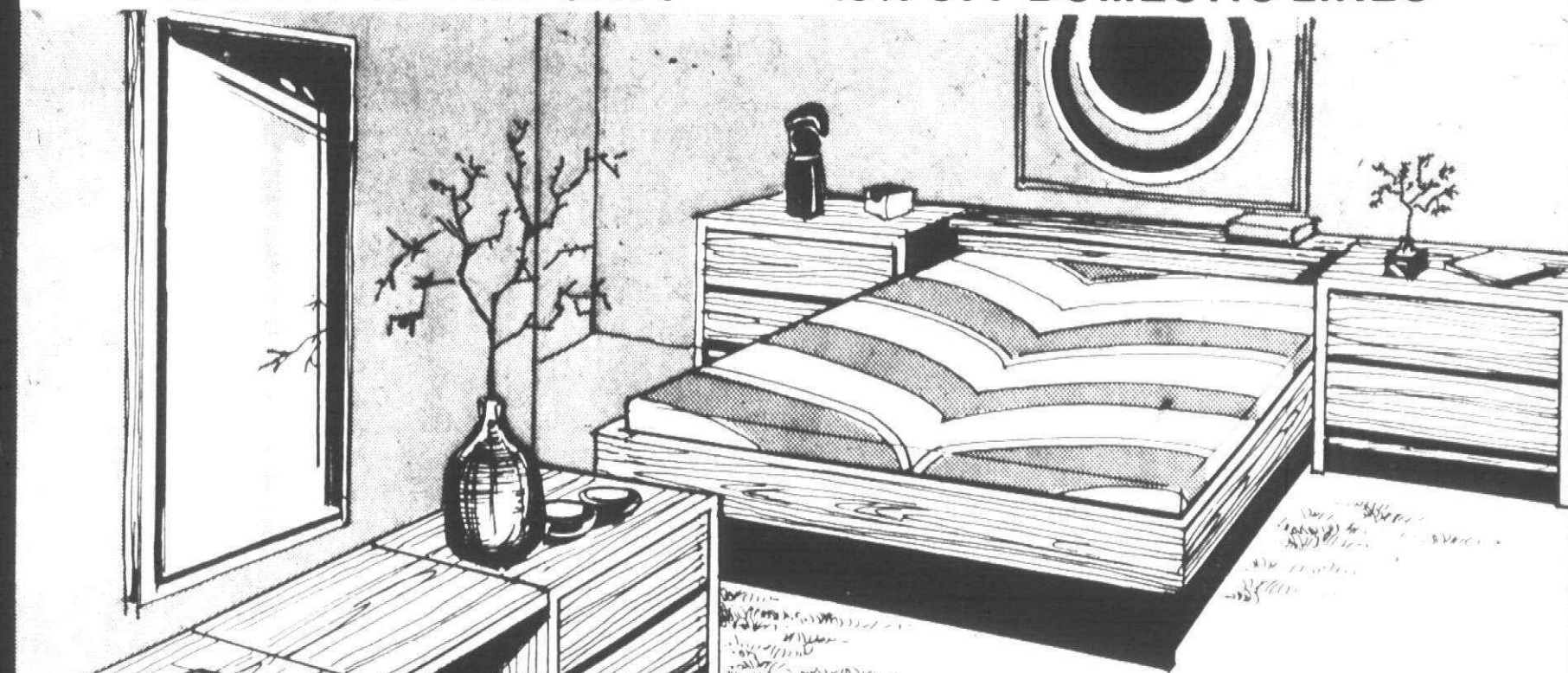

Grant to nursing program

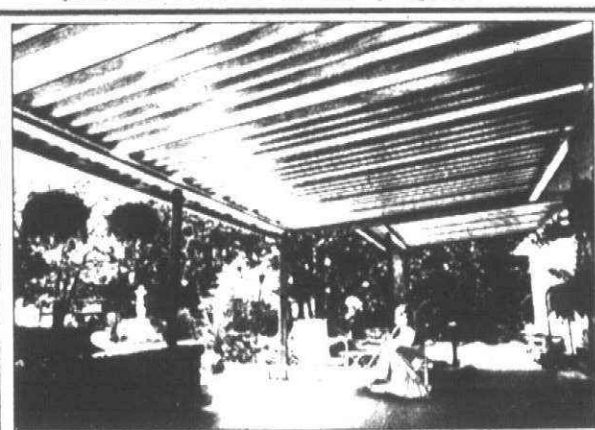
Madonna College of Livonia has received a federal grant of more than \$92,000 to expand and upgrade its nursing curriculum.

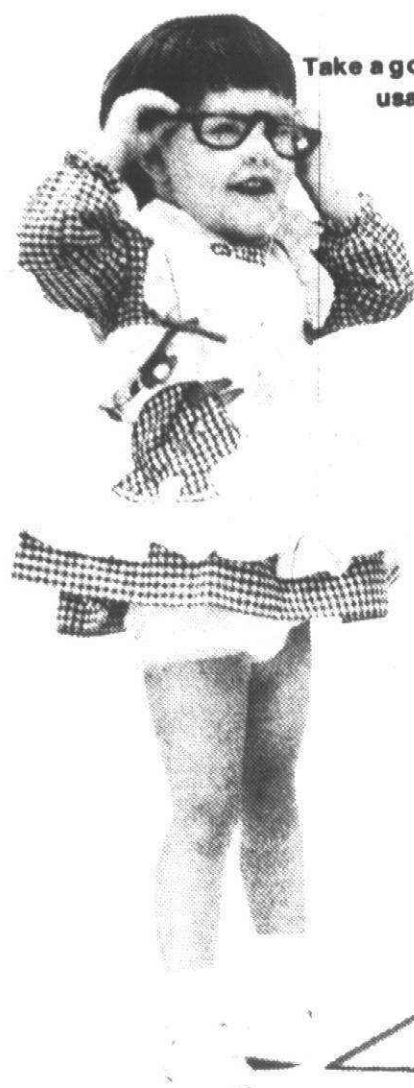

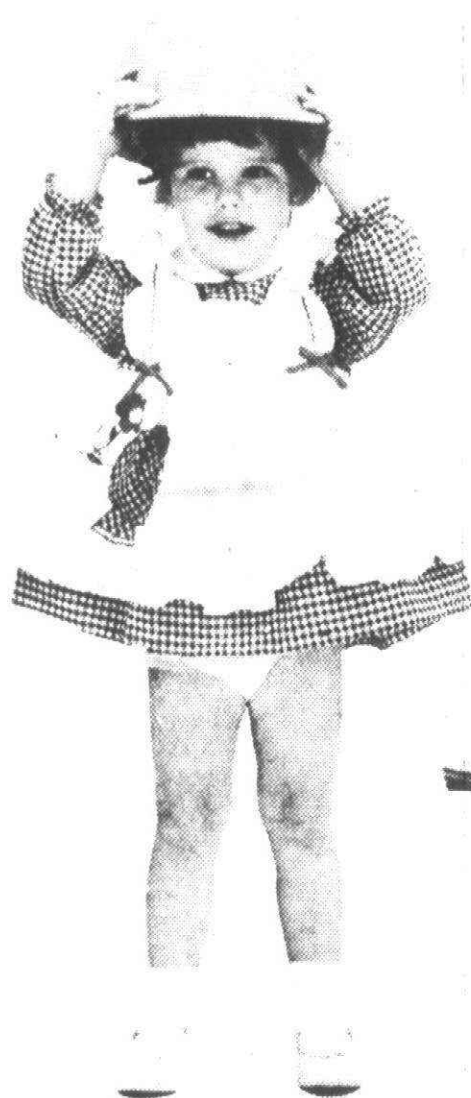

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Bond and renewal can save money

Editor:

The inclusion of the \$29 million bonding proposal on the April 23 ballot raises several questions, one of which is: What are the benefits to me and my children?

One rather obvious response is it will provide the classroom, associated space and facilities for the additional children that will be enrolled in the school system.

A second reason is to renovate, repair and refurbish if you prefer, existing schools. This work is primarily directed to bringing the schools into compliance with today's safety standards, repairing various items before they have to be replaced. Generally,

Drive to recall Stein a foregone conclusion

The "recall Harold Stein" movement is the non-news event of the year. Peter Bundarin and Robert Greenstein talked about recalling Stein, should he be elected supervisor, while Greenstein still occupied the supervisor's office.

As much as Greenstein will holler and protest, they both stand to gain politically if Stein is recalled. Both are lending moral and physical support, and supporters, to the dump Stein drive.

Bundarin makes no bones about his desired constituency: The subdivision dweller. In the other corner is "the farmer," which means someone who doesn't live in a subdivision or lives in the elite suburbs and holds an option to develop once-rural land.

This is the way the recall rhetoric sounds: Supervisor Stein, four months in office, is "ignoring the concerns of the majority of Canton's residents (read subdivision dwellers)." He is ignoring growth problems and overriding the recommendations of the hordes of study groups.

SHOULD STEIN be recalled for being "unresponsive," as he's been accused? No.

The fact that Stein voted to begin advertising for a chief for the Canton Police Department is a reversal of his personal desire to keep Canton cops a low-profile, low-pay, part-time department. So, in this instance, Stein has responded to citizen pressure demanding increased police protection.

Stein's attitude that growth will regulate itself is his weakest flank. He still clings to a laissez-faire policy on growth—the community's most pressing issue. Stein's answer on growth is to let the growth management committee study growth opinions but we'll let industry and profit regulate

itself—and sewer capacity and sewer availability will dictate the extent of our development.

SHOULD STEIN be recalled because he is "overriding" the study committees? No.

Stein claims he was just disseminating his opinion and is then criticized for trying to dictate direction. Stein should make his opinion known more often so the community can evaluate his position. This can be done while the study committees are meeting or any time.

But some unenthused members of the study committees claim their research on growth and land use is a pretense of citizen involvement. Their argument is, "His mind's made up," meaning Stein's. This supervisor phobia must end. There are seven members of the township board and Stein is one vote.

Stein is still too eager to help the landowner redeem his rural investment by selling undeveloped land to build another subdivision full of cul-de-sacs and children who will have to be schooled and serviced.

But Stein is well aware that he is a minority leader. That's a good spot for a politician to be. On the spot.

But no imperative reason for recalling Stein has surfaced.

Avoid leading Stein to the convenient whipping post—the recall election—just because we may disagree with some of his policies. Redford Township is just recovering from a 1976 recall election that slowed everything but bullfighting for almost a year. Canton can't afford that delay. As you are undoubtedly aware, this is not a sleepy community.

How you can have an impact

A lot of our money goes for taxes and contributions and payments, and we never see the results. It's frustrating, because we get the feeling we've had no impact on society or the community.

Metropolitan Detroit Girl Scouts—Camp Holly. South Oakland Girl Scout camps—Narrian and Yntema. North Oakland Girl Scouts—Camp Sherwood.

Jewish Vocational Service—south Oakland satellite facility. A YMCA branch in Farmington. Improvements to the Wayne-Westland YMCA. The YMCA Oakland branch.

And others in the metropolitan area. Anyone care to have an impact on the community?

and falling more in bad times than such factors as wages, interest, rents and expenditures.

THE GOVERNOR'S proposal would remove taxes for workers' compensation and unemployment compensation from the SBT tax base.

That makes elemental sense. Why tax taxes on taxes? Moreover, those taxes for workers' compensation and unemployment compensation are certainly no gauge of ability to pay.

What is a little cloudier in the governor's message is the suggestion of credits for businesses with small incomes. Some questions have been raised as to what these mean and whether they are adequate.

Surely, however, those cannot be major stumbling blocks as the Michigan Legislature hammers out a new SBT. We will expect our legislators to go over the governor's bill with a fine tooth comb; that's what legislators are for. But we would be disappointed if the clear, logical reforms the governor has suggested were to be dragged down by wrangling over details.

IN THE STATE senate, Milliken's SBT reforms are now in the hands of the senate finance committee, the correlative house committee having declined to take them up right away.

The finance committee is headed by Sen. Patrick McCollough (D-Deerborn), who, as every politically aware person knows, has a burning itch to be governor. That's fine, it's the American way, and good luck, Pat. But on behalf of the ailing businesses in Michigan, we must urge that neither Milliken nor McCollough uses SBT as a political tool, to pander votes by playing on the fears and pocketbooks of persons who want to get back to business.

The goals are revenue stability, taxation based on ability to pay, and some simplicity in the tax forms. Those can't be such difficult goals to achieve among politicians of good will.



Olympia II in suburbs is sound business decision

There seems to be so much negative comment about Olympia II and the Red Wings moving out of downtown Detroit that you would think the world was coming to an end.

Suppose you have a retail business and you check and find that all of your charge customers live in the suburbs and your store is downtown?

If you're smart, you move your store to a suburban shopping center where your customers are.

Before the Detroit Lions left for Pontiac they checked where their season ticket holders lived and found that they were better serving their fans by moving north.

A new arena or stadium does create a better economic climate around it, because of the service businesses flock to it. There is no doubt that Detroit would have profited from the Red Wings and Pistons staying downtown and playing in a new arena.

But we get so parochial in our views. If the new arena actually will draw more ticket-buyers to Pontiac, then business activity as a whole will improve in the metropolitan area and in Michigan.

And let's face it, an arena outside of downtown Detroit will draw more fans.

Take the Pistons, for example. They draw about 7,000 fans a night. Half black and half white. They say it takes 8,000 fans to break even.

THE ABILITY TO FIELD a top-notch team depends on how much money the team can take in so they can bid, attract and keep the best talent.

The top players in basketball are black so you would expect the sport to have the largest number of black fans. But the Pistons are barely filling half the Cobo Hall Arena. So where are the supporters? They can't seem to attract more blacks, and the whites aren't coming.

Approving the renewal won't hike your taxes

On Saturday, April 23, voters in Plymouth-Canton Community School District will decide the fate of a \$29.75 million bond issue and a five-mill property tax renewal.

The bond issue would provide construction funds to accommodate the additional 5,500 students who will enter school doors in the next five years.

The millage renewal, however, is needed to pay for the needs of today's students. The renewal will not increase the present school tax rate. A renewal merely maintains operating income at the current level. Defeating it could result only in a deterioration in the education given today's students.

For that reason, the Observer endorses a YES vote on the five mill operating levy. Although some residents may want educational programs to level off, we believe few want education in this community to go backwards.

THERE ARE THREE reasons in the minds of many residents why they might vote against the millage renewal—rising taxes, increased salaries and benefits for teachers, and dissatisfaction with experimental educational programs.

Let's face these issues head on.

First, rising taxes. Again, the five mills isn't a tax increase. If tax bills increase, it's because of higher property assessment. If you vote against the renewal to offset the assessment hike, your total tax dollars will decrease. But do you really want that to happen?

Let's look at the dollars. If you own a \$40,000 home, a "no" vote on the renewal will save only you \$100 a year. But a "no" vote by a majority of residents will cost the school district more than \$2 million in reduced revenues. The choice is whether a savings of \$100 a year is worth half-day class

sessions and classloads of 30-35 students per teacher.

A "no" vote on the renewal won't affect salaries and benefits received by individual teachers. All it will do is reduce the size of the teaching staff. Defeat of the renewal will mean layoffs of some 90 teachers, but the other 510 teachers will receive increased salaries and benefits. Defeat of the millage will result in fewer teachers, not reduced salaries or a freeze on pay.

There are parents dissatisfied with current programs who might be tempted to vote "no" as a protest. But programs cannot be improved with less money. Vomiting anger in someone's face may bring personal satisfaction, but it doesn't solve problems.

THE PROBLEMS of growth also must be addressed, which is the primary issue of the bond issue.

But the five mill renewal isn't directly related to growth. The renewal is a commitment to spend the same money on today's students as has been spent on students in the past. That is a commitment we all should share.

There are uncertainties in the future. But two things are certain—an increase in student enrollment, and continued inflation in operating costs. A third certainty is that the schools cannot cope today with less money. To do so would result in drastic reductions which this community will not tolerate.

So let's do what we must April 23. Why fool around and vote "no" Saturday, scream when the cuts come, and approve the renewal a second time around? We all know a "yes" vote is the only practical choice which can be made. Vote once, vote "yes," and remember that every vote counts.

That figure would only be the beginning. Those buildings are old and extensive renovations would be necessary plus trying to secure the criminals.

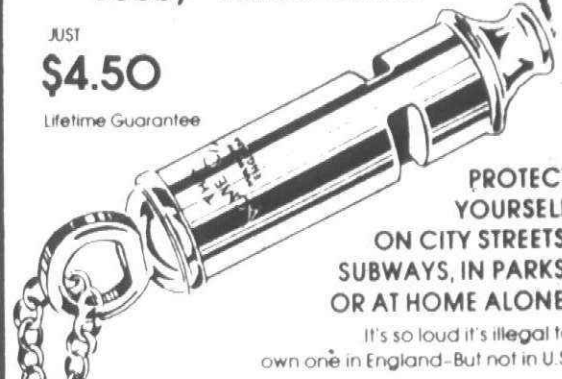
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Planning is missing

So about 26 per cent of our teaching staff is "no charge" to the taxpayers.

Other systems offer teachers who don't cost them a penny for health benefits another compensatory option, such as increased dental care or life insurance. Plymouth doesn't, nor has it ever done so as far as I know in the 22 years I have taught here.

It sounds unfair to me to make such a big issue on a deal that already favors the administration so much. Count your blessings, board of education members and administrators.

Next day's Toronto Globe and Mail carried the following headline: "Pratz draws a wealth of braves." This was from critic John Kraglund, whose withering critiques have made many artists cringe.

Kraglund wrote, "The enthusiastic and extended applause that greeted concertmaster Albert Pratz after his solo appearance in last night's Toronto Symphony concert at Massey Hall had about it an air of hometown boy makes good. In fact, it was considerably more than that. It was an interpretation that warranted a wealth of braves."

Melanie Murphy was in Toronto for a historic music occasion. Her father, violinist Albert Pratz, was realizing a 40-year-old dream. For the first time in this century, Max Bruch's Concerto in D was to be performed.

A hunt which covered 35 years and three continents was to vindicate.

Pratz first saw the concerto when he was visiting in London, England. He was studying his friend William Primrose's father's house when he saw the music. He was familiar with Bruch's first two concertos, and looked over the music of the third violin concerto, deciding he would like to play it. It took him 35 years to find another copy.

Whenever he was on tour—Canada, United States, South America, Europe—he searched music shops and book stores for the Bruch concerto. He was told many times that it did not exist.

It was not listed in any catalogue or encyclopedia. No one had heard of it except a few top violinists like Isaac Stern and Yehudi Menuhin.

It was during a 1974 European tour with the Toronto Symphony that Pratz asked a friend to look in Dopplinger's music store in Vienna. To his astonishment, his friend brought back the violin and piano score for the long-sought D Minor Concerto. Delighted with the find, the concertmaster started studying it while still on tour.

Amazingly, the orchestration for the concerto was found about a year later in the Canadian Broadcasting Company music library. The score was complete. He had both the violin solo part and the orchestration.

Mrs. Murphy said she was very nervous before the concert. Massey Hall had been sold out—there was standing room only for the two performances.

"The music is beautiful," said Melanie. She added that she was in the first balcony and a cousin was in the second balcony with most of the students.

"He just lifted his bow at the end of the performance when the audience rose to its feet and the braves and applause began. Three curtain calls, and the orchestra applauded too, they didn't just tap their bows, they applauded."

"And, as they do in Europe, an usher went up and gave him a huge bouquet." When the family went backstage after the concert they saw the flowers were roses, carnations and tulips.

The cousin in the second balcony reported later that the students were as enthusiastic as the rest of the concertgoers. "They were on their feet shouting braves the moment he completed the concerto."

The concertmaster was just plain Grandfather Pratz when we met him last year at the Plymouth Co-operative Nursery on Warren Road. His grandson attended the nursery and grandfather played the violin for the youngsters at the school.

Albert Pratz has made the first recording of Max Bruch's 3rd Violin Concerto with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, Andrew Davis conducting. Mrs. Murphy does not know the release date or the label. His other recordings include "The Voice of the Stradivarius" (London SDD-2118 B with an orchestra conducted by Ricky Hyslop, and "Concert Miniatures" (CBC SM-159) with pianist Elyakim Otaussig.

Tours planned

Springtime special in Miller Woods

A host of the season's first wildflowers will be identified in their natural habitat Sunday afternoon during the first of two nature walks through Miller Woods.

The hepaticas were at their peak earlier in the week. Clusters of the furry-stemmed blossoms popped through the carpet of dry brown leaves. They range in color from creamy whites, pastel pinks and lavenders, to deep blues and purples.

Hepaticas and other woodland flowers can be seen on the conducted tours of the woods from 2-4 p.m. April 16. Experienced naturalists will lead groups of 10 persons along the trails in the maple-beech climax forest on Powell Road near Ridge in Plymouth Township.

There will be spring beauties, blood roots, white and yellow trout lilies, May apples, and harbingers of spring, sometimes called "pepper and salt."

THE SQUIRREL CORN. Dutch-

man's breeches, Solomon's seal, false Solomon's seal, trillium, and yellow and purple violets will come later. A second walk is planned from 10 a.m. to noon, May 7 and Miller Woods watchers Evelyn and Bill Edgar say there will be many changes in the plant life in the three weeks between walks.

The woods is on a 40-acre tract of land owned by the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools. The acreage belonged to the Miller family and purchase of the wooded section was made possible by HUD funding with the understanding that it be dedicated to educational purposes.

A small group has been working to preserve the woodland in its natural state.

"We want to leave it to nature," said Mrs. Edgar. "Not human nature. If a tree falls, let it stay there."

Herb Conant, a member of the save Miller Woods group, hopes the Michigan Natural Areas Council will declare the woods a natural area. The forest has never been pastured or lumbered. The great old maples and beeches are judged to be about 100 years old. There are shag bark hickories, American elms, iron woods, spice bushes and wild cherry trees.

"There's paw paw in there too," said Mrs. Edgar. She added that she could not identify it at this time of year, before the leaves were out.

"THE SCHOOL DISTRICT" doesn't realize what a gem we have," said Mrs. Herbert Conant. "It is one of the earliest woods around here."

She explained that their own woods, about a mile away, is much later. The hepaticas in Miller Woods bloom weeks before the ones in the Conant woods.

"It's difficult to explain this unique

The film series "Roots," based on Alex Haley's best-selling book, will be shown at Dunning-Hough Library on Tuesday evenings beginning May 3.

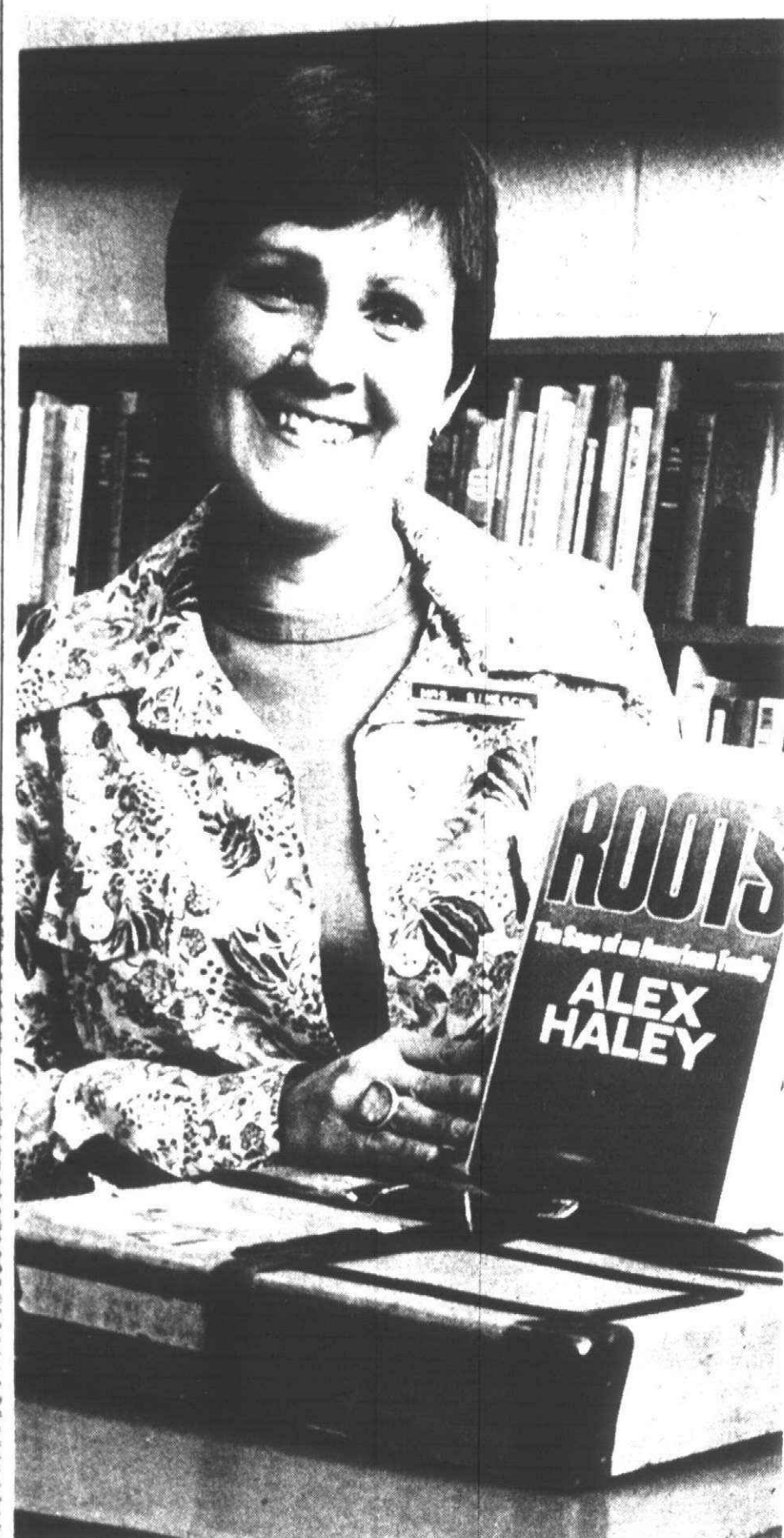
The series will be shown in seven consecutive programs of varying length. All programs will begin at 7 p.m. in the upstairs activity room of the library, Main Street at Church.

feature. It is on a high knoll. There are double hepaticas in there, but you have to look for them. The wild ginger grows in the low lands at the north end."

She said the Michigan Botanical Club was out last week. "There are more than 25 varieties of wildflowers in Miller Woods. And there are paw paw trees; it's very unusual to find them this far north."

It was Herb Conant who introduced the woods to botanist Warren Wagoner of the University of Michigan.

Since then the woods has become a classroom for the professor and students, who visit the climax forest several times a year.

"Evelyn Edgar has a slide presentation showing the four seasons of Miller Woods," Mrs. Conant said.

MRS. EDGAR lamented the changes in the woods over the last 25 years.

"There used to be lots of birds—even a foxes' den. There were deer in there. We still see chickadees, cardinals and flickers, but hunters have chased away most of the wildlife."

Penny Wright is chairperson of the Miller Woods committee, a small group which is trying to preserve the woods and cope with the everlasting problem—trash.

"We are trying to keep it clean—to show someone cares," said Mrs. Wright.

The stretch along Powell Road has become a township dump for everything from building materials to discarded furniture.

The school district put up two posts with a cable stretched between. It lasted one month. A group from First

Baptist Church of Plymouth cleaned it up last year. In two weeks it was littered again.

"Ideally, we'd like to find a better place for them to dump," Mrs. Wright said. "Last year we had a dumpster out there when we were picking up the trash. In one week it was filled and surrounded by junk dropped off by other persons."

We did get a commitment from the schools to have one person work with us," Gerald Vollrath, supervisor of new construction, is their contact with the school administration.

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The May apples had just poked through the spongy earth. Their umbrella-like leaves opened quickly during the 70-degree temperatures early this week.

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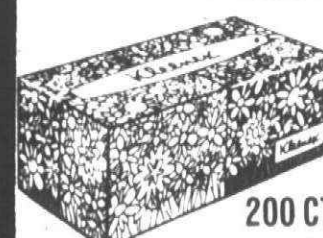
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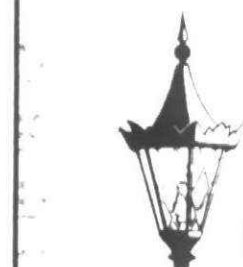
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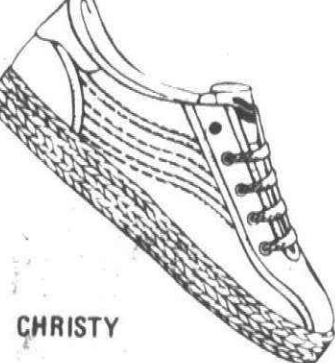
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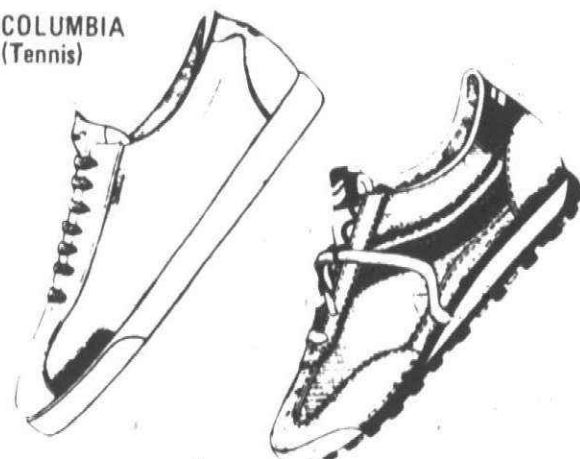

St. Mary parish readies new home

A transplanted congregation, full of pride in both Syrian ethnic origins and new American surroundings, is preparing for a long-awaited move into its new Livonia church home.

St. Mary Antiochian Orthodox Church, under the leadership of the Rev. George Shalhoub, will on May 1 dedicate its new building at 18001 Merriman between Six and Seven Mile roads.

That Sunday of Orthodoxy will be marked by the first divine liturgy in the new church and a visit by Arch-

bishop Philip Saliba, primate of the Antiochian Orthodox Church of North America.

Visiting also on that occasion will be Livonia church people and officials, including Mayor Edward McNamara, who has issued a proclamation congratulating Fr. Shalhoub and his congregation on their accomplishment.

The St. Mary congregation, now numbering about 100 families, has done a lot of moving before settling in the \$400,000 building that contains a

sanctuary, kitchen and social area and three Sunday school rooms.

Established in the early 50s in east side Detroit, it found its worshipers dwindling as the Arab-speaking ethnic groups began migrating to the outer edges of the city.

THE DETROIT property was sold in 1969 and the congregation tried for a time to set down roots in Southfield. Not much growth occurred, though, until Fr. Shalhoub arrived to head the flock.

Members in this area met for a

time in St. Innocent Russian Orthodox Church in Redford Township and then, in the fall of 1973, began accepting the hospitality of Mt. Hope Congregational Church of Livonia while waiting to establish their own church home.

Eventually the property on Merriman, complete with a centennial home, was purchased. Ground-breaking was in 1975 and the congregation used for a time the old home where Fr. Shalhoub, his wife Nina and their two children are living.

The Mt. Hope cooperation was an especially satisfying one for the St. Mary congregation, Fr. Shalhoub said.

"We will always treasure the excellent hospitality of the people of Mt. Hope who shared their building," he said, adding that they and their pastor, the Rev. Joseph Cimborra, "will always be welcome in our church."

The Congregational minister, coming for an inspection tour of the new St. Mary premises, rejoined that his people were "glad to have been of small service—it was no big thing to do."

FR. SHALHOUB'S leadership was praised by Leo Snage of Redford Township, former president of the congregation, and George Khamis of Livonia, current leader.

"We've come a long way," said Khamis. "The priest has done a fine job."

The clergyman, for his part, noted that he and his family, along with the rest of the congregation, were delighted to be in a community like Livonia and were enjoying especially the chance to live in a house more than 100 years old.

He said that the St. Mary congregation would be participating in Livonia's garage sale in May, the only group to offer ethnic foods for that event.

"We try to save every part of this country," he said, "because it is the place where all people can have freedom."

Born in Syria and educated at Balamand Seminary in Tripoli, Lebanon, he now has completed a degree in sociology and counseling at Eastern Michigan University and has applied for United States citizenship.

During his time as pastor of St. Mary he has been pleased to see a merger of two branches of the Antiochian Orthodox church, one centered in New York and one in Toledo, so that the visit of his eminence, Metropolitan Philip, will be as a representative of the entire Archdiocese of North America.

Completion of the new building represents the first phase of a building campaign financed through pledges and loans.

Later the St. Mary congregation plans an addition with more church school rooms and a hall.

If the title "Requiem" makes you think of something for a funeral, don't be frightened by the Plymouth Symphony Orchestra's offering at 4 p.m. Sunday, April 17.

Conductor Wayne Dunlap says Giuseppe Verdi's "Requiem" has all the theatrical intensity of one of the great master's best operas—in fact, it was written shortly after he completed "Aida."

And that was one reason the work has sometimes been controversial: It was written as the setting for a

mass but has a "distinctly operatic style," according to Prof. William J. Weichlein, Plymouth Symphony annotator.

FOR THIS performance, the orchestra will be joined in the auditorium of Plymouth-Salem High School by the Kenneth Jewell Chorale, 45 voices under the direction of Eric Freudigman.

And as the first performance was underwritten by the mayor and council of Milan, Italy, this one will be

supported by the Michigan Council for the Arts and the Plymouth Symphony League.

Soloists will include some familiar names and some new names to local audiences: Carolyn Grimes, soprano; Anne Jaffe, mezzo-soprano; Ian Lyons, tenor; and Conwell Carrington, bass.

LIKE THE "REQUIEM" itself, Verdi's life was a mixture of the theater, the church and politics, Dunlap noted.

The work's sections are the same as the parts of the Catholic mass—which Verdi would know intimately because his first musical job, at the age of 12, was as his parish organist.

It was written to commemorate the first anniversary of the death (in 1873) of Italy's greatest literary figure, novelist Alessandro Manzoni.

Verdi, though he professed to hate politics, knew the issues intimately. As a child, he knew first Napoleon and later Austrian repression in his native village of Roncole. His operas were frequently in trouble with Austrian censors, and he had to change places, names or titles in both "A Masked Ball" and "Otello" to get around censorship.

Verdi's name became an acrostical symbol of nationalism: "Vittorio Emanuele, Re d'Italia."

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


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But track league is tough

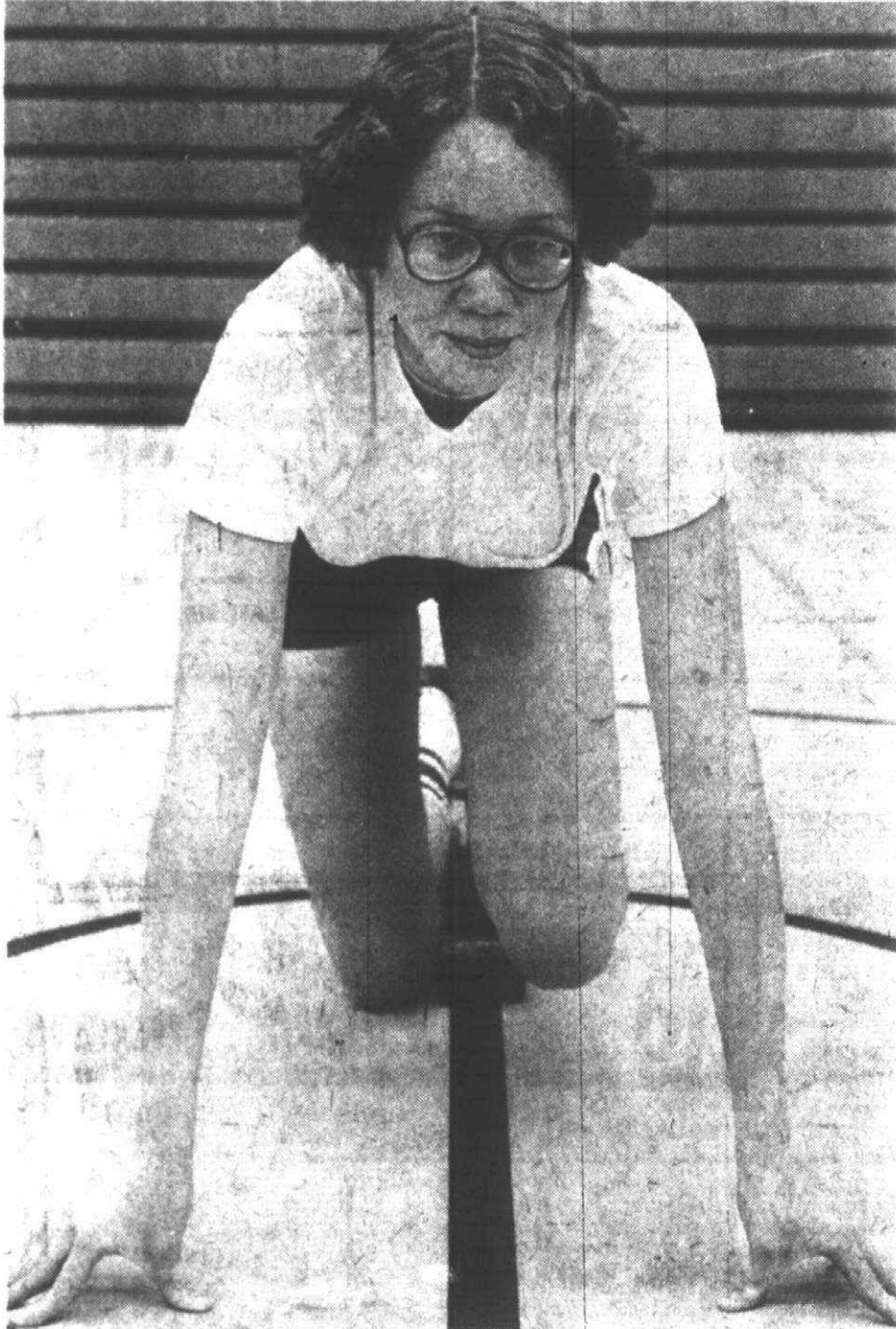
Rocks hope to improve

Plymouth Canton's girls track team looks strong and mature under the third year of leadership by coach Barb Winn.

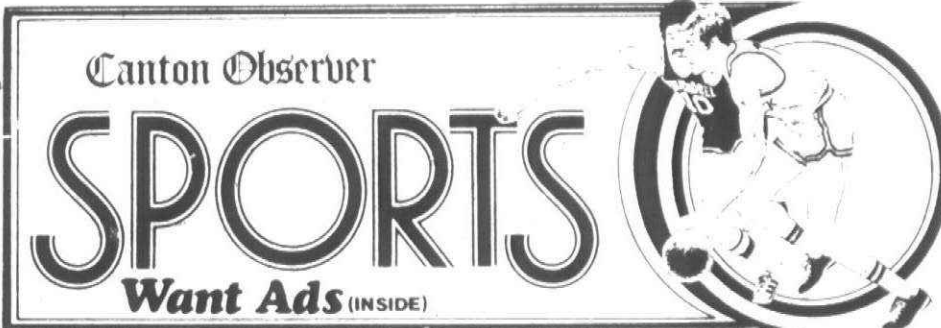
"All last year our victories at meets came down to the last relay," said Winn. "With a stronger team this year, we may not have to rely on that final run."

"Perkins was the big-get plus for us," Gable said. "He blew the ball by some free-swinging kids. He had a good fastball and a sharp curve. And his control was excellent."

"He looks like a real stopper and we've been

looking for that in our staff," Gable said.

"I'm glad we had a close second game. It was good for us to experience this before playing Stevenson. I don't know how Stevenson is as a team, but they have some of the best talent in the area."

Canton plays Stevenson and Bishop Borgess in back-to-back doubleheaders Friday and Saturday afternoons at Central.

DESPITE THE easy time the Chiefs had producing runs in the first game, Gable was disappointed in the offensive performance of the team as a whole.

Gable pointed out many of the Chiefs' 19 runs in the first game

Steve Barnes, Greg Kregoski, Steve Seippel, Brett Butler and Scott Caldwell are other top seniors on this year's squad.

Heading the list of juniors is Andy Lewis, a transfer from Livonia Churchill, who throws the shot put and discus.

"He can do anything in the field events," Spitz said about Lewis. "He is the most outstanding all-around athlete I've coached. And he enjoys a variety of track activities."

Mike Kiefer, Mike Mowry, Martin Hincley, Arron Tomalak, John Spelich and Dennis Hennels and other top junior prospects.

Spelich was a member of Canton's basketball team and Spitz says he inspires a lot of team spirit into the squad.

"I like the way he works," Spitz said. "He is team-oriented even though this is an individual sport."

Sophomore thinclads include Dave Tanner, Peter Bundarin, Scott Kiefer, Jerry Van Berkley, Dave Talaga, Rich Fleischer, Dave Parrot, Dave Kronan and Brian Pijanowski.

Bundarin is an outstanding shot put and discus competitor. Tanner works at the pole vault, and Kronan is a surprising sprinter.

"We have a crew-and-a-half of freshmen," Spitz said. "The future looks bright for Canton."

Some of the top freshmen prospects include distance runners Dan McGinn, Dave Spitz and Brian Oik.

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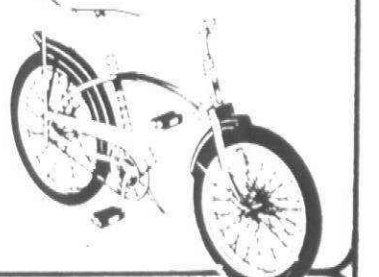
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Salem JV splits DH

NOTICE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF STATE HIGHWAYS & TRANSPORTATION Proposed Improvements to M-153 (Ford Road) at Haggerty Road

All interested citizens are advised that the Michigan Department of State Highways and Transportation is planning to reconstruct the intersection of M-153 (Ford Road) and Haggerty Road in Canton Township, Wayne County.

The proposed project calls for the widening of Ford Road to five lanes from Haggerty Road westerly for approximately 700 feet; the widening of Haggerty Road to five lanes extending approximately 350 feet to the north and to the south of Ford Road; and the addition of another lane to westbound Ford Road between I-275 and Haggerty Road.

This project will require the acquisition of the following pieces of right of way: a 27 foot wide strip on the south side of Ford Road extending approximately 750 feet westerly from Haggerty Road; a 27 foot wide strip on the north side of Ford Road extending approximately 625 feet westerly from Haggerty Road; and 27 foot wide strips on the east and west sides of Haggerty Road extending approximately 460 feet northerly from Ford Road.

Under Federal Highway Administration policy, any citizens who would be affected by the proposed plan may request in writing that a formal public hearing be held concerning the social, environmental, and economic effects of this proposal.

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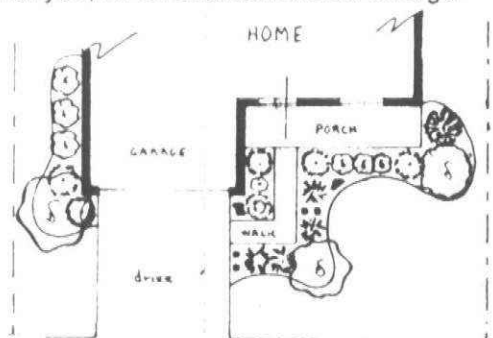
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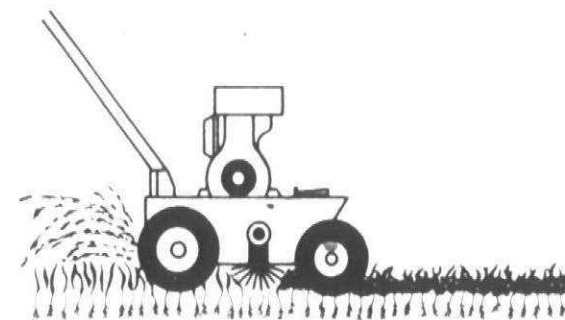
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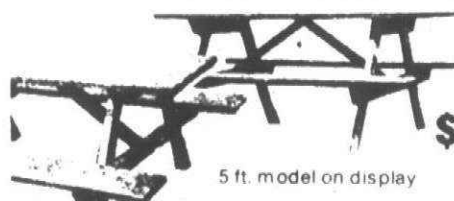
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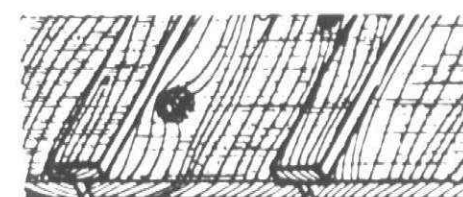
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Doc's Corner

DRC off to good start

Wolverine Harness Raceway got its meet off to a flying start Monday evening, as evidenced by a new all-time opening betting mark of \$803,363.

A crowd of 7,105 on the balmy night set the new wagering mark, which eclipsed the old record of \$734,923 set during opening night last year.

The per capita (average) figured to \$113 per person, giving strong indication that entertainment dollars are still in abundance in the western suburbs.

Shortly after 8 p.m. Monday, a five-year-old pacer named Hasty Tour, who is owned, trained and driven by Raymond Fuller, of Pleasant Lake, became the first of 840 race winners of the Wolverine meet.

The 84-night stand lasts through July 16.

In the winners' circle to greet Fuller and Hasty Tour were Wolverine track officials, who presented the traditional "lead shank," symbolic of capturing the initial race of the season.

Officials of the Livonia track were hoping to see the 300th two-minute mile in the 28-year history of the facility on opening night. However, the closest any horse came to doing it was Steady Sket, a six-year-old pacer, who was clocked in 2:01.8 in winning the Inaugural Pace.

Tom Wilhelm, track superintendent, said, "The track is as fast as last year when we got 142 two-minute miles, and if they don't start going under two minutes the next couple of nights, they'll do it for sure when the better horses race on Friday and Saturday."

An awards ceremony is planned for the horse and driver who are the first to crack the "magic" two-minute barrier to give Wolverine its 300th such race.

All but one of the current 299 two-minute miles were recorded on the mile oval. Belle Acton turned the trick in 1958 over the inner half-mile course, which was eliminated in 1970.

With his winning drive aboard Steady Sket in the Inaugural, Lee Sattleberg, of South Lyon, found himself perched on top of the driver standing.

Sattleberg also guided Brewer's Chips, a 12-year-old mare, to victory in the third race.

From a handicapping standpoint, Monday's opener may have shed some light on which horses can be counted on to win.

Horses on the opening night card came from three main tracks—Northville Downs, Windsor Raceway and Pompano Park in Florida.

The horses which last raced at Northville captured seven of the 10 races. Windsor horses accounted for two wins and J.W. Castle, who last raced in New Jersey, won the 10th.

Of the seven horses on the program which had last raced at Pompano Park, only one finished in the money, while most were supported at the betting window.

Quintus, a five-year-old gelding, finished second in the third race to keep the Sunshine State products from being shutout.

Richard Wilson, vice-president and general manager at Wolverine, summed up opening night by saying, "I'm very happy with the way things went. There's every indication that harness racing is just as popular as ever in the area and we should have another record meet."

Star invitational trotters will appear on tomorrow's race card, with the best invitational pacers to take the stage Saturday night.

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Spring is here!

Spring is finally here, thank goodness. Forget that poppycock about robins and ground-hogs. The sure way to tell that it's going to be another eight months before you have to shovel 12 inches of partly cloudy weather off your driveway is when the perch start their spring spawning run in Saginaw Bay.

Which they started to do, about two weeks ago. I headed up there last weekend and took about 150 of the little beauties near Caseville, at the tip of the Thumb. That's about a 2 1/2-hour drive from the Metro area.

The jumbos, running to about 1 1/2 pounds, were hitting minnows and jigged Swedish Pimples in 25 feet of water about two miles offshore, but there was plenty of action for shore anglers, too. The run should hold strong at least through this weekend.

Perch are astonishingly social during the run. They travel in huge schools, and fishing luck is largely a matter of finding a school and staying with it.

For some great tasting fried perch, mix a cup or so of pancake flour with enough milk to form a thin, smooth-textured batter. Put it in the freezer until it's very, very cold.

The freezer is the secret, because when you dip the cleaned fish in that super-cold batter and drop them in a hot frying pan with some bacon grease heated until just smoking, the steam escaping from the super-cold batter cooks them as much as the frying does.

AN ADULT hunter safety course? Goodness knows, a lot of adults could stand to take one, but until recently I hadn't heard of such an offering.

The Western Wayne County Conservation Association, whose grounds are in western Plymouth Township, gave 36 students a two-day seminar in cooperation with the state Department of Natural Resources. They were awarded certificates of competency after passing a 100-question exam.

Wish Bob Laich at the club would have told me about the course in advance. A lot of other adults might have wanted to take the course, and the club might have picked up some new members.

James Walker of DNR tells us: "So far, nine states require that first-time hunters under a certain age prove that they've taken such a course. In three Canadian provinces, age is not even a factor."

"Whether you're 16 or 60, if you're buying your first hunting license there, you must prove that you've passed an approved safety course."

Michigan United Conservation Clubs, with which the Western Wayne club is affiliated, plans to seek such a law this year in Michigan. Bless 'em!

BELLEVILLE LAKE has a lot of fish, it says here.

The friendly DNR reports the western Wayne County lake just south of us has come back excellently since it was chemically treated in 1973 to kill off the carp.

Electroshocking and netting surveys, along with an extensive creel census, indicate many walleye, bluegill, largemouth bass, white bass, crappie, perch and channel catfish.

White bass are showing up in good numbers below the Ford Dam.

No question about it: Belleville Lake has fish, but it also has a dozen zillion power boaters, and fishing from a boat out there is like riding a roller coaster.

IF TROUT fishermen can't find the state's most elusive and challenging fish in area lakes and streams this year, it won't be because the state didn't try to make it easy.

Something like 80,000 rainbow trout, 10,000 lake trout and 16,000 splake (hybrid speckled and lake trout) have been planted in Livingston and Oakland counties lakes.

Taking the places alphabetically:

- Livingston County—Appleton Lake, 5,600 rainbow; Lime, 2,800 rainbow.

- Oakland County—Cass Lake, 30,000 rainbow and 10,000 lake; Crescent, 9,000 rainbow; Deer, 7,000 rainbow; Dickinson, 2,000 rainbow; Little Silver, 3,500 rainbow; Maceday, 10,000 rainbow and 8,000 splake; Union, 14,000 rainbow and 8,000 splake.

From now until legal opening day, there is a catch-and-release rule with fly fishing only.

From now until May 31, you may fish with flies only and must release all fish. From June 1 to Sept. 30, normal trout fishing rules apply.

78 lakes to be tested for water quality

The cleanliness of some 78 lakes in Livingston, Washtenaw and Oakland counties is being examined this month as part of a new inland lake sampling program by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

"This program will characterize the water quality of the lakes and provide us with information on possible causes of poor water quality," said SEMCOG Council on Environmental

Strategy Chairman Richard Cogger, Mayor of Lathrup Village.

"The results from this will help us develop recommendations for improved management of inland lakes. These recommendations will become part of the area-wide water quality management plan that SEMCOG is developing under provisions of the federal Clean Water Act," he said.

All lakes in this program will be

sampled when the warmer weather has melted the ice cover on the lakes and in the late summer when the weather will have heated the upper layers of the water while the lower levels remain cool. These are the two critical periods in the yearly life cycle of inland lakes.

Sites will be chosen at the deepest section of the lakes.
