

Helicopter swoops down on B&E suspect

A night off from the assembly plant paid off for Verible Vipperman, a Canton man who discovered a burglary in progress when he returned home Monday evening.

Robert McFall, 20, of Plymouth, and Vera Kinzinger, 18, of Canton, were arraigned Tuesday on charges of breaking and entering an occupied dwelling with intent to commit larceny before 35th District Court Judge Dunbar Davis.

Both were released on \$5,000 personal bond, and were bound over to circuit court in Westland for a scheduled June 2 hearing.

An aerial arrest drama unfolded when Vipperman pulled into his driveway at 49279 Ford Road, next to Alpine Nursery, and noticed a strange car parked on his property with a male and female inside. Vipperman had returned with his girlfriend from an ice cream store when he was supposed to have been at work.

He said he walked around to the back of his house and caught the two subjects running out the door. They ducked behind the swimming pool in the backyard," Vipperman said. "Then the man took off running through the field and the girl went

back to the car parked in front. "I told her to hang around. I knew them; they hang around with my kids."

VIPPERMAN'S GIRLFRIEND phoned the police and three Canton police cars and two Wayne County sheriff patrol cars arrived moments later. "The police cars pulled up so fast, my girlfriend said it looked like S.W.A.T. on TV," Vipperman said.

All units were notified of the man running north in the woods toward Hanford Road. Less than 20 minutes later, McFall was spotted coming out

of the woods by the Wayne County air patrol, police said.

Ptl. Pilot Robert Michalak landed the helicopter in a field off Hanford Road, where Ptl. John Wasilenski confronted the suspect. McFall allegedly threatened Wasilenski with a tire iron, which police said was used to pry open Vipperman's back door.

Wasilenski drew his gun and took McFall into custody.

The county air unit is rarely called on to make an arrest, but is used to aid patrolmen in cars, according to a sheriff's spokesman. But because it was getting dark and the suspect was

near an open field, the helicopter landed and the suspect was apprehended.

Both Vipperman and the sheriff's spokesman were quick to laud one another for their combined efforts. Vipperman said the suspects never had a chance because of the sheriff patrol's fast work.

THE SHERIFF'S SPOKESMAN, in turn, complimented Vipperman for giving the police an excellent description of McFall and detaining Ms. Kinzinger.

Vipperman, who works at the Ford

Motor Company's Wayne Assembly Plant, said all he could find missing from the house were his "nerve tablets"—a bottle of Valium.

Both McFall and Ms. Kinzinger waived further examination before Judge Davis on Tuesday. McFall stated that he will represent himself on June 2, while Ms. Kinzinger accepted a court-appointed attorney.

The couple waiting in front of Vipperman's home, an 18-year-old male and a 17-year-old female, did not face any charges.

Ousted ZBA hires atty. who files dismissal motion

Daniel Burress, attorney for the five ousted members of Canton's zoning board of appeals, said Tuesday he will ask the court to throw Supervisor Harold Stein's lawsuit out of court because it doesn't belong there.

The Livonia attorney says he filed an answer to Stein's lawsuit and will also file another motion asking Wayne Circuit Judge Neal Fitzgerald to dismiss Stein's suit because it asks the court to make a decision that Burress believes the attorney general must make.

"Our contention is that the proper action Stein should be seeking is 'quo warranto,'" Burress said. "Any determination of who is the legal office holder when it's alleged that someone

wrongfully holds public office must be brought by the attorney general, not the court."

NO HEARINGS on zoning variances have been scheduled while the court decides which of two zoning boards is legal. Some builders have been threatening to sue the township for the delay.

Ex-supervisor Robert Greenstein contacted Burress to represent him and four of his fellow ZBA members interests.

Canton board of trustees removed the five after following the advice of board attorney William Sempliner who said the Greenstein ZBA was improper because Canton's zoning law conflicted with a state mandate at the

time of appointments.

Although five people were appointed as required by state law, Canton's local zoning ordinance called for three members. Sempliner said this made the appointments invalid but Attorney General Frank Kelley said on March 10 that the state law supercedes all local ordinances and called the Greenstein ZBA appointments "perfectly proper."

Burress said that Stein's suit filed by Sempliner attempts to avoid the "proper authority" which, he says, is Kelley.

A hearing date on Burress' motion for dismissal of Stein's case is set for May 20 at 2:15 p.m. in Fitzgerald's court.

Small house discontinued but homeowners still mad

A pledge to discontinue building homes modeled after an 1,100-square-foot ranch has failed to placate residents of Canton's Willow Trail Subdivision, who claim two other models that will continue to be offered by Bert L. Smokler & Co. will downgrade their property values.

Tom McNamara, president of the Willow Trail Homeowners Association, called Smokler's pledge to withdraw the Manor II model from the market "a handful of crumbs they expect will please us."

According to McNamara, Willow Trail residents want no more homes in their subdivision like the three Smokler models now being built. Instead, residents want homes that have brick on all sides, two-car attached garages and at least 1,600 square feet. Residents want houses that are "compatible with their own homes, priced in the \$50,000 range a few years ago."

Although the Manor II model drew the most criticism from residents, McNamara says two other Smokler models, priced in the \$40,000 range, are smaller than existing subdivision homes. All have brick fronts with aluminum on the sides and rear, and two of the models have only one-car attached garages.

BUT SMOKLER CO. had hoped its pledge to build no more homes mod-

eled after the Manor II would placate the irate residents.

"Because of your repeated requests, Bert L. Smokler & Co. has caused an extensive review at its corporate level pertaining to its building operation at Willow Trail Subdivision," said Smokler's attorney, David S. Snyder, in a letter to Canton Supervisor Harold Stein.

"Smokler & Co. will consent that effective immediately the bottom-of-the-line ranch home currently under construction and merchandised as the Manor II will be withdrawn from the market. The model of this home now under construction will be completed and sold, and this type of home will not thereafter be offered for sale in Canton Township."

The letter failed to describe Smokler's stance on other demands of Willow Trail residents, however. The square footage, extent of exterior brick and the type of garage Smokler would construct on other Willow Trail homes were not mentioned.

Smokler spokesman Tanny Bush was unavailable for comment.

"This letter to Stein isn't what we're looking for at all," McNamara said. "They mentioned they'd remove that model from the market six weeks ago. The letter doesn't prevent them from building another ranch just like that one and calling it the XYZ."

ACCORDING TO McNamara, Willow Trail residents want a covenant from Michigan National Bank, forcing Smokler and any other builder to construct houses "compatible" to existing homes in the subdivision.

Michigan National Bank owns the 120 undeveloped lots still remaining in Willow Trail, and Smokler has an option to buy them. Peter Bundarin, attorney for the homeowners association, is currently negotiating with the bank for a covenant.

"We're concerned about the value of our homes," said McNamara. "It's not the price of the Smokler homes we're worried about. Inflation distorts that too much. It's just that we want houses built that are harmonious with our own."

Miller Woods tour is slated

The second of two scheduled nature tours through Miller Woods will be from 10 a.m. to noon Saturday, May 7.

This tour follows a Sunday walk in April when Plymouth-Canton residents viewed the wide variety of flora existing in Miller Woods—a climax forest on Powell Road near Ridge Road, now owned by Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

Board delays new bond try

Fearing another bad community reaction, members of the Plymouth-Canton school board said they would not be in favor of asking voters to approve a trimmed down bond request June 13.

Last week voters turned thumbs down on a \$30 million bond issue which would have been used to build new schools, cover repairs and renovations on existing buildings, and provide money to start extended school year (45-15) schedules in five new schools.

The board had asked the administration to prepare "three or four" different bond proposals for its consideration. Under state law, the same request could not be put back on the ballot for at least 180 days.

At a workshop meeting Monday, Supt. John Hoben presented bond packages ranging from \$7-\$14 million which would qualify for placement on the June ballot. However, the trustees indicated the timing was bad.

The district election committee had recommended the board wait until October before asking for another bond, even though the interest rate will be higher.

In other discussion, the board decided to wait until May 23 before making a decision on what kind of 45-15 schedule should be used this year.

"WE DON'T EVEN KNOW why people voted down the last bond," said Trustee Tom Yack. "We need a scientific analysis of what their reasons were. Then we can put out some positive information."

It would be foolish, said Trustee George Lawton, to come back with a watered-down request that would not serve the needs of the district.

Other trustees said the chances of getting a bond improved would be better if there was more community involvement in preparing the request.

"If we do not pass a bond by Sept. 15," Hoben told the trustees, "the interest will be \$800,000-\$1 million. In addition, after that date, we will not be able to put the bond on this year's tax roll." Despite those drawbacks, however, he also was in favor of holding off any bond request until at least October.

Hoben said that without the money the bond would have provided, the district would have to scrape by as best it could. "Hopefully, we will not have to make any program cuts. We will have to get our expenses out of the general operating budget."

Last September the board levied half a mill which was put in an escrow account. Hoben said that money would be used to offset the cost of beginning the expanded 45-15 scheduling.

ALTHOUGH THE BOARD had anticipated designating one 45-15 calendar for all the schools slated for year-round classes, several mix-ups prevented them from making that decision.

Originally, the district calendar committee was supposed to present the board with a number of calendar plans, so it could choose the one that best served the needs of the district. But those proposals were not available for Monday's workshop.

The crux of the calendar question is whether to put the schools on a staggered track system, which would mean that students in the four tracks (groups) would begin and end the school year at different times, or switch to a "block start" schedule, which would allow the six 45-15 schools to end the academic year at the same time.

Despite the fact that the staggered schedule has been used for two years at Miller Elementary, Hoben maintains it would cause problems on a district-wide basis.

Joe Crissey home and walking

Operation successful

It was 12:15 p.m. at the Crissey household when a 12-year-old boy walked into the living room, rubbing his eyes after a long night's sleep. While this is quite late for a young boy to be sleeping, it really didn't matter to his happy mother.

The late sleeper was Joe Crissey who was home recovering from brain

surgery which kept him in St. Barnabas Hospital in New York City for the entire month of April.

Joe was home, alive and well. And for the first time since the operation, he was walking.

It hasn't been an easy month for the

Crissey family. There has been that constant concern over Joe's brain surgery, the recovery, and most of all, Joe's happiness.

Joe was stricken with a rare nervous disease (dystonia musculorum) about five years ago. As the symptoms grew worse, Joe was unable to walk and went to school in a wheelchair.

Joe's parents, Jan and Fred Crissey, researched ways of helping control this ailment with hopes of seeing Joe walk again. In their research, they came across a book written by Dr. L. S. Cooper which described a type of brain operation called cryogenic surgery.

This operation wasn't thought of as a cure, but it did give some hope of relieving Joe's muscular pains.

Joe went to New York, the only place where this kind of surgery takes place, three summers ago. At that time, the doctors said it would be best to wait until Joe was older and physically stronger to handle such a delicate operation.

Joe finally made that New York trip again last month where the operation centered around helping his right side.

WHILE RECOVERY has been a long, slow process since the surgery, the Crisseys are finally seeing some progress in Joe's physical abilities.

"When people ask if the operation helped Joe, we say it did—but it didn't look that way," said Joe's mother, Jan Crissey.

Mrs. Crissey explained that when Joe first came home he was "totally incapacitated" and very depressed about it.

"This is the first time we have ever given Joe any hope," said Mrs. Crissey. "We hoped he would be better after the operation but at first he wasn't."

Joe was a little depressed because he didn't see himself getting better. He always was able to accept it (the

disease) and never let it bother him. But after the operation he was frustrated because he couldn't do anything. I never saw him so depressed like this.

But as the days go on, Joe has been able to use his hands and actually walked around the house last week. The stability of the right side of his body has continued to improve each day.

And the more Joe has moved around, the more his spirits are lifted.

"The doctor said we should see progress each day," Mrs. Crissey said. "And Joe has seen this progress which is more exciting. This has lifted his spirits."

Mrs. Crissey explained that the process of recovery involved the "nerve pathways relearning" the new, and correct way of regulating Joe's muscles—undoing what went on for the last five years.

"The operation has obviously helped," Mrs. Crissey said. "And it's better now that we all see progress—and that Joe's happy."

SO WHAT'S THE next step?

Well, the possibility of Joe returning to New York for an operation on the left side should come sometime this fall.

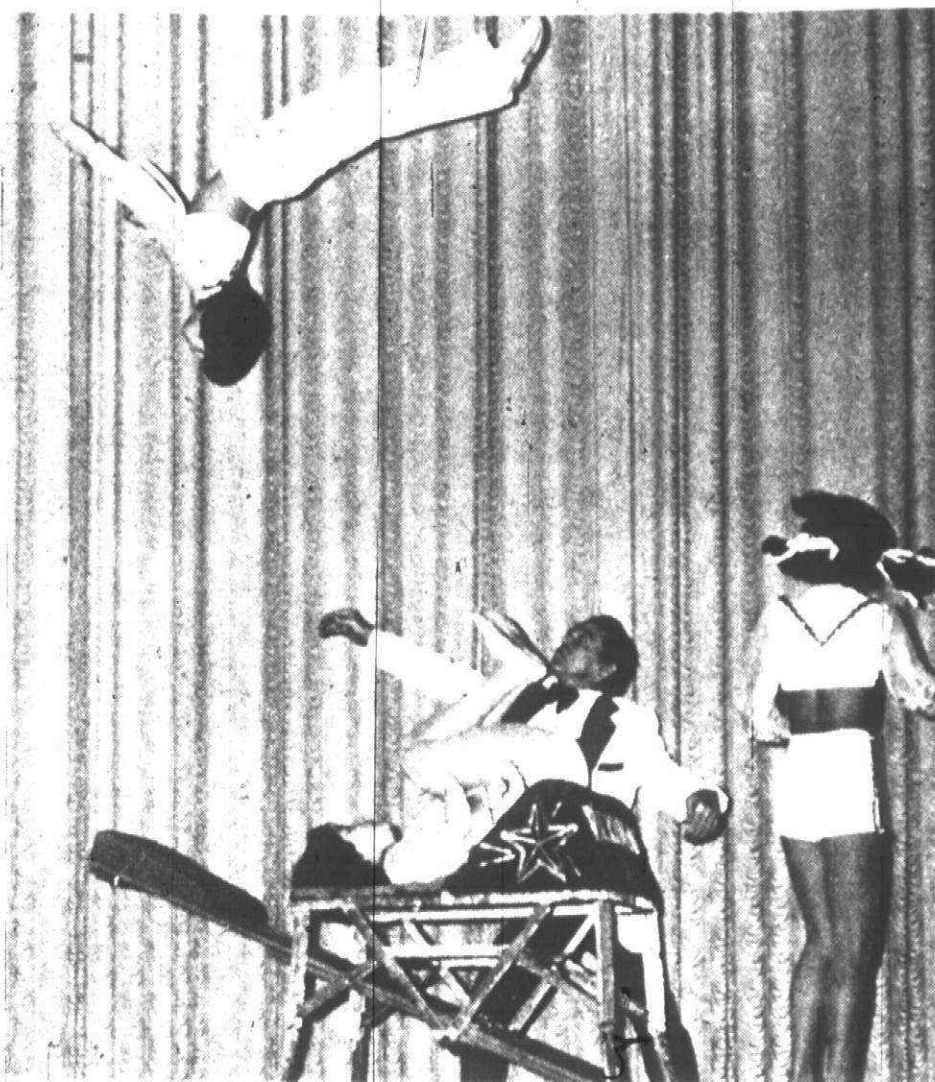
"It all depends on Joe's progress," Mrs. Crissey said about a possible second surgery. "We have to allow Joe's body to recover. Plus, the doctors want to see and observe the total picture and recovery before taking the next step. And that takes a long time."

"If they can only do on the left side what has been done on the right side, then Joe will be in good shape and should be able to walk."

A FUND-RAISING drive, which helped the financial costs of Joe's operation, took place three years ago involving everyone in the community. Close to \$10,000 was raised.

At this time, Mrs. Crissey says "as far as money is concerned, we will be okay for the second operation."

She also wished to express her family's appreciation to the community.

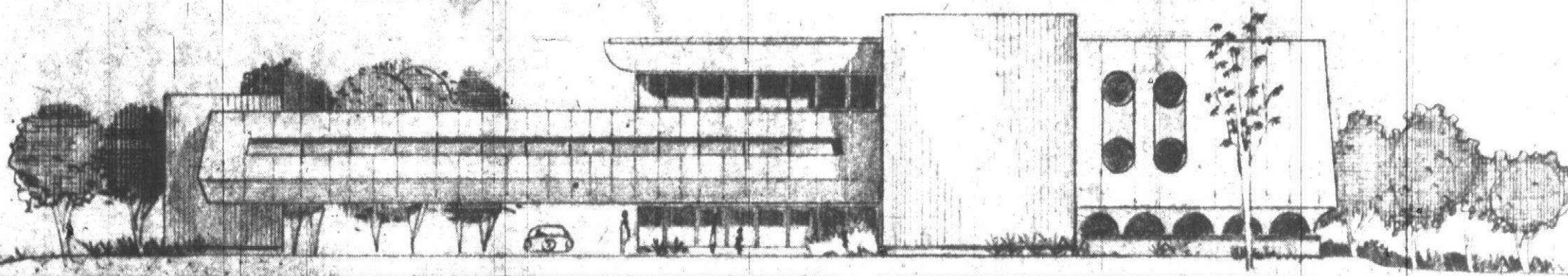

Stein lifts the shovel to kick off twp. hall

Canton Township "put on the dog" Saturday morning at groundbreaking ceremonies of the new \$2.7 million township hall being built on the southwest corner of Canton Center and Proctor.

The fire trucks and recreation vans were shiner than usual and township officials wore their Easter suits and dresses on a made-to-order warm, sunny morning.

Supervisor Harold Stein battled a case of the jitters as he introduced the special guests and local dignitaries at the fire-meeting hall.

"It might sound a little strange," Stein said, "but I did invite Jimmy Carter."

Stein got back a letter from Fran Voorde, director of scheduling for the President, thanking him for the invite, but explaining that "it will not be possible for him to join you or send a representative. The President has asked me to send you his very best wishes, particularly for a most memorable day."

"Well we tried," Stein said. He went on to introduce Helen Waino, aide to U.S. Rep. William Ford; State Rep. Tom Brown; County Commissioner Royce Smith; Lou Stein, former Canton supervisor; Joe West, Plymouth Township treasurer; Plymouth Mayor Joe Bida and 35th District Court Judge Dunbar Davis.

Before the group of about 100 people were transported by van down Canton Center to the groundbreaking site, Stein called the federal grant "a definite godsend to the people of Canton."

The embattled supervisor, facing the possibility of recall, talked about problems he faced before the shovel went in the ground.

"This grant is a great blessing," Stein said in an official statement "but it has been an uphill battle since we received word that our application had been accepted."

Stein mentioned the fight over where to build the township administration building. In February, two months after learning of the grant approval, trustees were deadlocked over a site for the municipal complex.

Three members of the board wanted to build the hall on land under condemnation proceedings located north of Fire Hall No. 1, at Canton Center and Cherry Hill. Stein and two other board members wanted the Folker's Nursery property, bought by the township in 1976, to be the site. Trustee Robert Myers opposed both sites because it is his belief that the administration building will be too costly to maintain.

After much wrangling, Clerk John Flodin and Trustee Brian Schwall changed their site preference to the Folker's option and settled the issue.

Trustee Lynne Goldsmith held to her conviction that building the hall on the west side of Canton Center Road would open up the western half of the township to residential development.

Unlike Myers, Goldsmith believes the building should be built even at the "less desirable site" and she showed up for the groundbreaking ceremony. Trustee Brian Schwall missed the ceremony because of a Saturday class he attends.

Stein said, he met more opposition and had to make two trips to the Economic Development Administration (EDA) in Chicago to answer charges lodged by resident Peter Bundarin.

Bundarin told the EDA the township hall would harm the agricultural environment and violated zoning law because no variance was secured from the zoning board of appeals for the three-story structure.

Bundarin defends his actions saying that he did not want to see Canton lose the grant but did want to make sure that the requirements were legally met.

But most of the hassling was forgotten Saturday when the citizens and politicians showed up to witness the formal groundbreaking and have their pictures taken for posterity.

Architects Des Hamill and Gene Ralls, who designed the new building, explained that official groundbreaking began April 28, which marked the 90-day deadline for groundbreaking.

All EDA grants have a tight schedule because they were designed by Congress to stimulate employment.

The work officially began, explained Ralls, when stakes were put in the ground and the boundaries were marked off.

The first floor of the building will house the offices of the clerk, treasurer and supervisor. The second story will be occupied by building, water and recreation department employees. The use of the third floor is undetermined at this time, although Stein predicts it will house a temporary library and senior citizen facilities.

A large meeting hall will be on the first floor and additional meeting rooms will be built in the basement.

The R.E. Dailey Co., construction manager for the project, is aiming for a Spring 1978 completion date.

More eligible for free food

Only 2,000 people are participating in the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) nutrition program, made available through the Wayne County Health Department. County Commissioner Royce Smith thinks people who do qualify for coupons—worth \$25 in protein, iron and calcium-rich food—may not be aware of the federally-financed assistance. Free groceries such as milk, cheese, eggs, fruit juices, cereals and baby foods may be purchased with the coupons.

A certification procedure requiring approval of a health department nutritionist or public health nurse is necessary to qualify for the

may qualify. The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program is designed to insure a proper diet for pregnant and nursing women, infants and children through age 5. But people with medical problems or who lack a nutritional diet may also be eligible. Senior citizens may meet these conditions.

Operating at maximum budget, the WIC will provide \$1.8 million worth of food yearly in Wayne County.

New committee aims for better relations

Finding new ways for the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools and the business community to work together is the goal of the Plymouth Chamber of Commerce Education Committee.

Since its first meeting on March 22, the committee has worked on a speakers' bureau, a survey of business and school resources, and school-business communication.

The idea for a chamber education committee came from Janet Curlee, chamber manager. Chairperson of the committee is Pat Gibbons, assistant principal of Pioneer Middle School.

The committee has been meeting once a month at the board of education office. The group has identified common objectives of the educational and business organizations.

A survey of chamber members will be made this month to find out about speakers for school classes, possible student tours, and how to improve the liaison between education and business.

AT THE SAME TIME, teachers will be asked about the kinds of resources that would best meet the needs of their students. The committee hopes to compile a resource file from the information.

Members of the committee are Betty Stremich of the Hillside Inn, Claude Cornwell of National Bank of Detroit, Florence Beier of the schools, Leonard Evans of Ford Motor Co., Joyce Willis, the schools job placement director, and Ron Griffith of Schoolcraft College.

Hearing set on rezoning

A public hearing has been scheduled for 7:30 p.m. June 6 by the Plymouth City Commission to consider rezoning from business to multiple properties bounded by Ann Arbor Trail, Union, Hamilton and Roe streets.

The zoning changes have been recommended by the planning commission. The area has been studied since December by a three-member subcommittee of the planning commission which made direct contact with 95 per cent of the affected residents.

"We are trying to take what is now a hodgepodge of zoning and put together into a meaningful package," explained Tex Thomann, planning commission chairman.

The recommendations call for rezoning of parcels from Central Business District (B-2) to Multiple-Family Residential either RM-1 or RM-2.

The planners noted that present zoning in this area has remained unchanged for several

years, yet commercial development hasn't occurred except for commercial and office uses along Ann Arbor Trail between Hamilton and Union.

"Ann Arbor Trail is a main artery to the Central Business District with a traffic pattern which justifies continued commercial developments," states the planning commission's study of the area. "Except for the Ann Arbor Trail commercial and office uses, the industrial use on Hamilton, and some non-residential uses on Union, the area under study is primarily residential." An analysis by the planning commission shows the area is 82 per cent residential.

The planning commission concluded, "The predominant residential use over the last several years suggests a zoning revision that is more consistent with the current and potential use. Land values in the area may dictate an intensive use that will require high density building construction."

10 new cops hired, equipped

Steps to expand the Canton Police Department were taken Tuesday night, when township board members appointed 10 graduates from Schoolcraft College's reserve training council to the force, gave sergeants a pay hike and scanned applications for police chief.

Board members voted 5-2 to hike the pay of uncertified sergeants from \$2.30 to \$4 an hour and hike the pay of certified sergeants from \$2.83 to \$4.25.

Treasurer Anne Bradley and Trustee Lynne Goldsmith voted against granting the raise recommended by the township's police commission. Township officials, they felt, should not grant any raises to police officers until a police chief is hired.

Board members adopted another recommendation of the police commission when they voted 6-1 to hire 10 additional reserve officers expected to graduate today from a Schoolcraft College training program.

To be hired, the reserves must graduate from the Schoolcraft program, pass a physical examination, sign an affidavit attesting to Canton residency and score adequately on a firearms test.

In other action, the board voted 6-1 to appropriate \$3,000 to equip the new officers.

Trs. Bradley voted against hiring and equipping the new reserves.

Residents expected to join the police force as reserves are Raymond Broestan, Vincent Chan, James Hanna, Rene LeBlanc, Cary Marakov-

itz, Joan Marakovitz, Sam Natoli, Joan Roan, Robert Rayston and Ernest Sayre.

Board members agreed to meet privately after next Tuesday's township board meeting to screen the 23 applications submitted for the police chief post. Board members will weed out the applicants lacking the necessary five-year experience in police supervision and turn over the remaining applications to the Michigan Municipal League.

The League will interview the police chief applicants and administer written and oral tests.

Police chief hopefuls who submitted applications by the May 1 deadline are Carl Silvers, current commander of the Canton Police Department; Frederick Benson, a member of the Livonia Police Department; Clattie Berryman Jr., a lieutenant with the Detroit Police Department; Lt. Russell G. Blanchard of the Detroit Police Department; Eugene Caviston, a retired member of the Detroit Police Department; and Lt. Arlee Dansfield of the Washtenaw Sheriff's Department.

Other applicants are Capt. Elliot D. Fredland of the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department; Ptl. George W. Glover of the Detroit Police Department; Robert Hislop, executive lieutenant with the Detroit Police Department; William D. Johnson, commander of the Clinton Township Police Department; Sgt. Edward Juarez of the Inkster Police Department; John J.

Karpach, a retired Detroit police officer; Sgt. James Kinett of the Detroit Police Department; and Richard Kurkowski, an executive sergeant with the Detroit Police Department.

Other police chief candidates include Sgt. Sigmund Latarski of the New York Police Department; Walter D. MacGregor, former police chief in the City of Wayne; Lt. Harold Mel-drun of the Wayne Police Department; Sgt. Dennis P. O'Leary of the

Land is purchased for township park

Swings, slides and other play things common to a municipal park will eventually fill a 20½-acre parcel of land on Saltz near Morrison and Ramier.

Although Canton officials aren't sure what type of equipment they'll eventually purchase for the site, board members agreed by a 6-1 vote Tuesday night to purchase the land owned by Detroit Edison for future development as a municipal park.

Trustee Robert Myers cast the only vote against purchasing the land for \$130,000. Specific terms of the purchase agreement have not yet been negotiated.

RESIDENTS OF Camelot, Parkwood and Westbrook subdivisions stamped their approval on the township purchase when they returned sur-

vey forms distributed by members of the Camelot-Parkwood-Westbrook Homeowners Association.

Although only 76 of the 265 residents who received the hand-delivered forms replied, association president Tom Quinn said 63 residents endorsed the park idea, 10 were opposed, and three were indifferent.

Clerk John Flodin said he asked Quinn to conduct the survey, because the proposed park abuts property of residents in the subdivisions.

"I feel very strongly that this is a desirable purchase," Flodin told township trustees. "Detroit Edison wants to sell the land, not lease it. If we don't buy it, someone else will."

The site is located south of a Detroit Edison power station.

His main concern is that the staggered track method is not flexible enough to allow changes from one track to another or from an elementary school to a middle school on a traditional nine-month calendar.

Because the calendar committee did not have its recommendations ready, Hoben suggested that they be brought before the board at its regular meeting on May 9, and a decision could be made then.

However, the trustees objected to the lack of time this plan would create. "This is all new to me," said President Joe Gray. "I don't know anything about it. If I'm going to make this decision, and it's a big one, I want more time."

Yack also complained about the lack of time. "I'm confused. I thought

the proposals would be here tonight. They are not. When do the people have a chance to say something?"

The issue was further complicated when Norm Kee, personnel director, pointed out that calendar schedule was a negotiable item and had to have the sanction of the Plymouth Education Association (PEA).

"Calendar has never been before the board," he said. "Never has the community been involved. We could get 500 different suggestions."

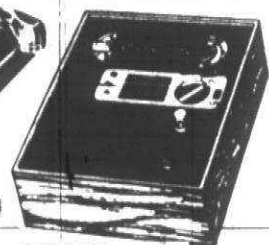
"We have always worked it out with the PEA. I can't see saying we're not going to do that anymore."

DNR releases 'moratorium'

A short moratorium on new construction permits in Plymouth Township ended last week when a Department of Natural Resources (DNR) engineer granted a permit to the developer of Westbriar Village.

On April 22, David Sprow, a DNR sanitary engineer, notified township officials that he was not going to issue the permit to the proposed 99-site subdivision because he felt the township was exceeding its allotted sewer capacity.

He also said he would not issue any new permits until he was satisfied the township had a plan to rectify what he termed excess sewage flow.

On April 26, Norman Dietrich, township engineer, sent a letter to Sprow, arguing that there was no figures to support the belief that the township was exceeding its allocated sewage flow of 9.6 cubic feet per second.

Dietrich also cited a Wayne County study which said Plymouth Township would not have a need for more sewer capacity until sometime after 1980.

On April 29, Sprow relented and issued the permit.

"I THINK IT was just a case of a state official getting too zealous and over-stepping his authority," said township Supervisor Thomas Notebaert.

The DNR is a regulatory agency which monitors pollution in state waterways and has final authority for approving residential and commercial sewer tap-ins. Had the moratorium on construction permits remained in force, there would have been no new development in the township.

"Dietrich's letter indicated that there wasn't the problem we originally thought," said Sprow in explanation of his quick change of mind.

However, he cautioned the township not to feel that the problem of excess sewage was completely out of the way.

"The township should not interpret our issuance of the Westbriar permit to mean that there is no sewer problems in Plymouth Township," he warned.

"We will be reviewing all future permit requests on a case-by-case basis and will be monitoring the sewer flow very carefully."

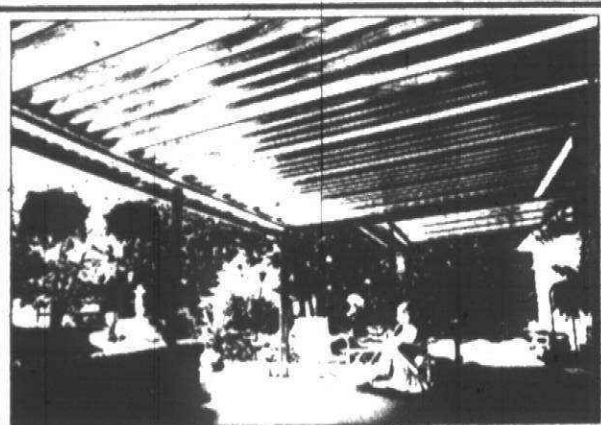

By blue ribbon group

Early report on elderly issued

The Blue Ribbon Study Committee on Aging has been given until Aug. 1 to come up with a recommendation on meeting the housing needs of the city's elderly.

The deadline was extended from July 1 by the Plymouth City Commission after hearing a preliminary report on progress thus far made by the blue ribbon study group.

The status report was given to the city commission Monday night by the Rev. Sam Stout, committee chairman, with subcommittee reports presented by Kari Miller, Walter Fletcher, Betty Andrews and Scott Dirk.

Dirk reported the subcommittee on housing didn't want to make any final recommendations until reviewing the survey of senior citizens needs to be taken this month. That was why the extension was asked for and granted.

After the report was presented, commissioners debated whether the mayor ought to appoint additional alternates or members to the study committee—organized four months ago. But the mayor, backed up by the commission, decided against making any further appointments as it was the committee's prerogative whether to expand its membership.

IN MAKING HIS report, Chairman Stout stressed.

"The successful execution of the charge we have taken for ourselves requires, first of all, thoroughness. In an area where little has been done, there is temptation to accept the much, but inadequate efforts that have been done as the successful completion of a task.

"Let us all be mindful as we go about our work of the wasted resources—material and human accounted for by half-done or poorly done tasks. Unless we do what we do thoroughly and completely, the year that we shall spend working will be wasted, the citizenry disappointed, and those for whom we exist (senior citizens), betrayed.

"While our ideal ought to be that of the betterment of all residents of Plymouth, there will be points at which we may have to choose which citizens we will put first. My understanding of the charge we have accepted is that the senior citizen is our first consideration, and his or her good is not to be compromised.

"Finally, our charge requires of us to remember that no one is ever helped without cost to someone. The aged of our community will be helped only at some cost—be it benevolent contribution, taxation, the sacrifice of the community's aesthetic appeal, real estate value, or just plain hard labor.

"While there remains yet much work to be done and while this preliminary report offers few concrete solutions to the needs and problems of the elderly, the committee has a great sense of satisfaction in the awareness that it has made significant progress towards the accomplishment of the specific charge given it. Much of the success of the committee will be determined by the outcome of the proposed survey to be conducted within the next few weeks," Stout concluded.

MRS. MILLER reported the survey subcommittee has developed a plan to survey, hopefully, every single senior citizen resident of the city from May 14-21.

Training sessions for volunteer surveyors have been scheduled for May 11, 12, 13 and 14.

At the subcommittee's request, the city commission voted 6-0 to authorize expenditure of up to \$1,000 for computer tabulation of the survey results. The tabulation will be done by Accounting Computer Service, Inc., of Plymouth, with owner Bill Morrison donating the computer time to make the expected total cost at about \$750. An estimate from Wayne State University to do the computer work would have cost about \$2,000.

MRS. ANDREWS presented the commission with an 11-page list of resources available in the area for senior citizens.

She said it would be almost impossible to prepare a permanent list for distribution because phone numbers change weekly and new services become available as time passes.

There was some discussion, though, about condensing the resource list and printing it in "The Golden Record"—a newsletter sent to senior citizens by the city's recreation department.

In his report, Fletcher recommended that the Council on Aging being organized by Harold Guenther be formally incorporated as soon as possible.

sible and that Plymouth and Canton townships be urged to participate as well as the city.

Fletcher also reported that his subcommittee has determined that the role of the Plymouth Housing Commission is to become involved in solving the housing needs of the city's elderly and low-income persons.

DIRK REPORTED that the housing subcommittee didn't feel it could make specific recommendations until obtaining survey results.

"The needs of senior citizens for housing must be determined first in terms of the number of persons who actually need or desire housing and, second, senior citizens' ranking of housing within the scope of all their needs.

"This information is critical to the

development of a plan for housing because other needs—such as transportation—may be of importance to the overall senior citizen population, and because the type of housing and financing alternatives must be matched to the number of units required, the income of prospective clients, and the attendant services needed."

Dirk's report noted that the specific housing plan should be developed by the Plymouth Housing Commission. "This agency should take an active role in acquiring housing for low income senior citizens. These plans should be coordinated with other alternatives in housing which are made by private developers.

"The planning stage should involve full community and developer interaction so that a balance between senior citizen needs, community needs, and cost effectiveness can be evaluated. Specific housing proposals should be made by private developers according to the guidelines established by the commission. This would not preclude public development by the housing commission to satisfy specific needs, such as housing with supportive services for dependent senior citizens."

AFTER THE REPORTS were presented, Commissioner Beverly McAninch asked if the survey process couldn't be expedited if the mayor agreed to appoint alternates to the committee from the AAUW and YMCA.

She referred to a letter from Stout that he was delaying approving the alternates until receiving approval from the mayor.

Bida said he would talk with Stout and let him know the chairman can appoint additional alternates if he wishes. "But I'm not making any more appointments."

The Stroller... Mother's Day reflections

With the coming of Mother's Day, The Stroller, like most fellows who left home to face the trials of the world, turns his thoughts to the days of his youth when he was more or less tied to his mother's apron strings.

This year, more than ever for some strange reason, his thoughts go back to an emotional evening in the little old frame house in the alley, when his mother made a decision that steered the course of his life.

Widowed only a few months before and left with five children of which The Stroller was the oldest, she sat with her family and pondered the future.

A friend walked in to offer assistance and remarked, "I will take one of the girls, raise her and see that she gets a good education."

In an instant Mother sat up in her chair and with an air of finality, said, "Oh no! We are all in this together. If we get to shore, we'll get there together. And if we sink, we'll all go down together."

That decision enabled her to keep her family together and enabled all of us to strengthen the bonds and family ties, instead of being broken up and seeing each other only on occasion.

IT WAS A RATHER difficult decision for Mother to make inasmuch as she was left with only a six-chair counter in a small lunchroom to eke out an existence.

But she met the challenge. Being of Pennsylvania Dutch decent she was a good cook. So she turned to

baking pies and other delicacies for the town's top families on special occasions. And, added to that, she hired out to do housework.

Scrubbing floors and washing windows held no horror for her. She accepted the task of raising a family. And she stuck to it.

Then came the day when she acknowledged the need of help and to get it she asked The Stroller, then in first year in high school, to quit and to learn a trade to help raise the girls.

"Knowing that the idea of leaving school was disheartening to The Stroller, she tried to comfort him by explaining that even though he wouldn't be in school he still would be learning."

She emphasized her words with, "What you have in your head no one can take from you."

AND SO The Stroller started out on the long grind of the workaday world, with the words of his mother still ringing in his ears.

In the months and years that followed, she raised her children, the hard way—scrubbing floors and washing windows.

ALONG THE WAY she developed a series of "one liners" with which she educated us.

For instance, when The Stroller got to the age where he learned the difference between boys and girls and started dating, she took him aside one day and said, wisely,

"Son, make your morning as long

as you can—your afternoon will be long enough."

That was her way of advising her boy not to rush into marriage as there still was work to do in raising the girls.

Another "one-liner" that comes to mind this Mother's Day was spoken the night The Stroller left the home fireside to head for Detroit and an entirely new way of life walking along the river of printer's ink.

As he embraced her with a fond good-bye, The Stroller's mother said, very simply, "I don't know how high you may climb or how far you may fall, but remember, if you ever want your watch fixed, don't take it to a blacksmith."

What she meant was simply that if I ever needed or wanted anything I should go to the persons who could help. It was sage advice.



S'craft grads told diploma worth \$250,000

If any of Schoolcraft College's 709 graduates had any doubt about the value of their degrees and certificates, commencement speaker Leonard E. Goodall set them straight. Economically, said Goodall, college graduates will earn \$250,000 more in a lifetime than others, and had a 2.9 per cent unemployment rate while non-collegians last year suffered 9.2 per cent unemployment.

"I hasten to add," said the chan-

cellor of University of Michigan-Dearborn, "that the dollar value should not be the only measure. More importantly, college education will help you to live a life, to understand how we live... to understand, Who am I? What is the world around me all about?"

Goodall's campus will become much better known soon to many Schoolcraft graduates, for UM-D reports the two-year college in northwestern Wayne County is the second largest source of its transfer students (behind Henry Ford Community College).

Goodall called UM-D and Schoolcraft "urban commuter" schools, and said they were both in the same line of work: "The value of an urban com-

muter institution is to make education available to large numbers who wouldn't have had it available in the past."

FOR HIS EFFORTS, Schoolcraft awarded Goodall an honorary associate in arts degree before an audience of nearly 2,000 Sunday afternoon.

Honorary degrees also went to: Leroy C. Bennett, of Plymouth, retiring after 10 years on Schoolcraft's board of trustees... a patron of the arts, especially the musical arts, (who) has worked tirelessly and with great personal effort and persuasiveness for the establishment of a fine arts instructional and performance center at Schoolcraft College.

Indeed, math teacher Bennett was

sometimes alone among the eight trustees in keeping alive the idea of a fine arts facility when Schoolcraft's great vocational-technical expansion took place. The project will be included in the next college bond issue.

Thomas C. Wilson, of Livonia, retired after 20 years on the Clarenceville Board of Education. He was active in promoting the establishment of Schoolcraft College, has worked in behalf of millage questions over the years, and served as a member of the citizens' advisory committee for apprenticeship and as a member of the citizens' advisory committee for senior adults.

Sister Margaret Rose Basso, of Livonia, since 1970 campus minister at the Newman House serving the college. "In addition to campus ministry duties, (she) has contributed her special skills to the Schoolcraft community through leadership roles in the development of Project Seed, Futures Week, the Widow to Widow program, the Death and Dying program and simulation gaming." Sister Margaret is only the second active college staff member to be awarded an honorary degree.

ABOUT ONE-THIRD of the students who earned degrees or certificates since last summer showed up for commencement, the rest having scattered to jobs or to four-year colleges around the country.

An official list will be published in Observer Newspapers in four to six weeks, when college officials have processed all grades and checked requirements.

Schoolcraft President C. Nelson Grote slipped in a plug for the 0.8 mill property tax proposal that will be on the June 13 ballot, asking friends of the college to volunteer for service on a steering committee.

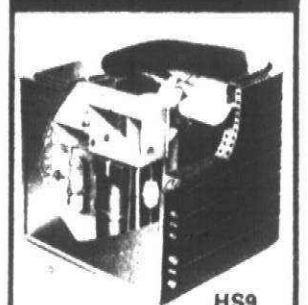
College dream impossible, says Bologna

Sending a youngster away from home for four years of college is becoming "the impossible dream" for many Americans, says Jack Bologna, candidate for the Schoolcraft College board of trustees.

Bologna told an audience of supporters in Hillside Inn April 28: "With typical tuition, books and board costs now running about \$4,000 per year and little hope for hardship grants if family income exceeds \$20,000, the only recourse for most middle class parents is the community college."

"The importance of community colleges in general, and Schoolcraft in particular, should not

McQuesten explains endorsement letter

"My friends felt I went overboard if I had it to do over again. I'd do it differently."

An unabashed Mark McQuesten, Schoolcraft College trustee and active Democrat, offered that explanation as three other Democratic leaders disavowed a letter to about 400 of the party faithful endorsing three candidates for the nonpartisan college board.

"I was given authority to write the letter," McQuesten said, adding that because of a deadline pressure he mailed it without giving the other three a chance to see it.

The others whose names appear on

the letter are: Paul Y. Kadish, chairman of the college board; Barbara E. Johnson, chairperson of the 2nd District-Wayne Democratic organization; and Wayne Parsons, chairman of Livonia Interested Democrats.

KADISH AND Mrs. Johnson signed a letter, which they intend to send to the same mailing list, saying that "partisanship does not belong on a community college board" and apologizing to the other six candidates for the "insulting" comments contained in the McQuesten letter.

The McQuesten letter, addressed to "Dear Friends and Fellow Demo-

crats," endorsed incumbent Rosina Raymond and candidates Karl Sjogren and Jack Bologna as "our best hope for preventing what can only be described as a Republican take over of the college board."

McQuesten's letter said the three would "avoid the loss of Schoolcraft seats to those who have only contempt for real democratic philosophies. We need only look at our own local school boards for examples to be avoided."

Kadish and Mrs. Johnson also disavowed those remarks about the other candidates and local K-12 school districts. They added that "the original

letter was not the work of, nor was its content reviewed by, the three recommended candidates."

This newspaper learned that Parsons, too, had issued his own apology over the incident, particularly to Laura Toy, another Schoolcraft candidate and also an active Democrat.

"THE INTENT to endorse candidates is still valid," McQuesten added in a telephone interview.

He said he was not concerned about the Republican organization taking over the Schoolcraft board, but about a different philosophy becoming dominant.

Tape deadlock continues at SC

A deadlock over whether to restrict tape recordings has prevented the Scholcraft College Board of Trustees from adopting written rules for audience participation at board sessions.

The board found itself in a 4-1 deadlock over whether to restrict unauthorized tape recordings, with five votes needed for passage. Three trustees were absent from the April 27 session.

Trustee Gerald Cox dissented on approval of the package of nine rules, which included the restrictions on taping. Board chairman Paul Kadish, vice-chairwoman Rosina Raymond, treasurer Nancie Blatt and trustee Mark McQuesten favored it.

BUT WHEN the board tried to pass the package without the tape rule, McQuesten balked. "I won't vote for a package until rule No. 9 is in it," McQuesten said, and the board was stalemated.

Angry Kadish said, "As far as I'm concerned, this board is in violation of the open meetings law if it doesn't have a set of rules." The next regular meeting is May 25.

The controversial rule would provide: "9. Any person in the audience wishing to record the proceedings of the board or any special hearings conducted by the board by using mechanical means, such as a tape recorder, must request permission to do so at the beginning of the proceedings. An individual making a mechanical recording without proper authorization will be requested to relinquish it to the board."

PRESIDENT C. Nelson Grote said the rule was drafted on the advice of the college's labor relations attorney, Virginia Metz of the firm of Butzel, Long, Gust, Klein and Van Zile.

Ms. Metz reasoned that the college needed to protect itself because comments in an employee discipline case could later become evidence in a court suit against the college.

A problem arose after an April 6 public hearing in which someone, apparently the friend of an employee appealing her firing, secretly recorded the session. A trustee noticed the recorder by chance, and other trustees were furious that they were being recorded without their knowledge.

A member of the audience suggested the board rewrite the rule to apply only to hearings involving employees and students. In these hearings, the board sits as a kind of court, hearing appeals from administration decisions, not as a policy-making legislative body.

The board did not, however, act on the suggestion.

ABSENT FROM the discussion were trustees Ron Cowden, Leroy Bennett and Arch Vallier.

Vallier, in semi-retirement, hasn't attended a board meeting since January. Bennett left early because of illness.

Cowden didn't attend, although at an earlier study session he said he saw no problem with allowing any recordings, especially since the new open meetings law provides that all deliberations of a public body must be made in public.

OTHER PARTS of the audience participation rules are likely to be adopted without controversy when the board holds its next regular meeting May 25.

The rules provide for "introduction and comments from the audience" following roll call and "comments from the audience" prior to adjournment.

No time limit is set for audience comments, although one may be set if many persons wish to speak. "Speakers are expected to be brief and succinct," the rules state.

Another proposed rule provides, "If all persons wishing to address the board cannot be accommodated within a reasonable time limit at a single board meeting, the chair will attempt to recognize persons speaking to both sides of the issue, request that spokespersons be identified and/or suggest that they return to speak to the board at the next meeting of the board."

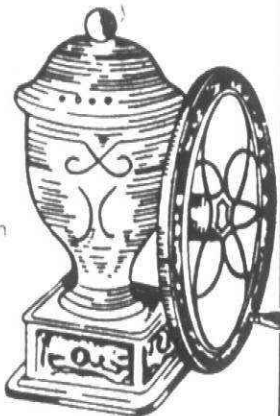

Police need forceful and independent direction

Monday night marked the application deadline for the job of chief of police in Canton Township. Twenty-three men—who hail from Canton, Livonia and all the way to Bardonia, N.Y.—placed an application for the full-time job with a starting salary of \$21,000.

The pay isn't remarkable but the person who will be picked must be. Canton's police department needs an undisputed leader who is strong without being overbearing and independent without overstepping his authority.

The 23 applications will be examined by the Canton Board of Trustees this week in a process designed to weed out anyone who is obviously under-qualified for the job.

FOR INSTANCE, one of the applicants only holds the rank of patrolman and one of the posted requirements for the chief job is that the applicant have at least five years experience in a police supervisory capacity.

So, this person's name will probably not be sent to the Michigan Municipal League (MML) for the final selection process.

Even though it is a costly service, the board's decision to let the MML handle the job interviews and recommend one person is a wise one.

Even before it was discovered that Canton never properly voted to institute the civil service code, it was evident that something was lacking the area of municipal hiring.

There is no real civil service commission in Canton and, judging from the flak over the recent testing of firefighters, the "commission" is not equipped to handle a task as important as hiring a chief of police.

The two remaining "civil service commissioners"—Grant Campbell and Bob Myers mean well but lack professional guidelines for interviewing and hiring. A strong set of hiring rules and eval-

Women's fight part of larger human battle

Everyone's consciousness was raised a few days ago when the fight for women's rights was highlighted at a convention for the National Organization for Women (NOW) in Detroit. Last week this newspaper described the participation of 10 women from Oakland County.

It was interesting to note that men played a major role in that convention through conducting seminars, supervising the child care room and serving as aides. This is as it should be. Men are slowly beginning to realize that the women's movement is part of a larger battle for the human rights of all people.

MOST OF THE ATTENTION at the NOW meeting was focused on the much maligned Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) to the U.S. Constitution. ERA has been ratified by 35 state legislatures and must be approved in three more to become law.

ERA merely prohibits discrimination against persons of any sex. Despite the hysterical criticism of many anti-ERA women, it should be ratified. It will not force housewives to abandon their roles. It will only affirm that women have the same rights as other citizens in this country.

The Oakland County branch of NOW has focused its attention on the unique needs of suburban women. It is especially concerned about the rights of the middle-aged woman, who, for reasons of divorce or death, is suddenly alone. Where can she go for legal advice? Where can she receive training to re-enter the job market?

The loss of the only breadwinner in an affluent, suburban household is especially traumatic to a family.

About 300 men and women belong to the Oakland County chapter of NOW which meets on the second Tuesday of the month at Birmingham Unitarian Church, 651 N. Woodward Ave. Ruth Jeffries of Bloomfield Hills, is the president.

WHAT CAN YOU do to help?

If interested in joining the county branch of NOW, you can become a member by showing up for any meeting.

Although the ERA has been passed in Michigan, people can help finance campaigns in other states. Donations can be sent to: ERAMERICA, 1525 M St., Suite 602, Washington, D.C.

An equal rights magazine, called ERA Monitor, will be mailed free by writing: ERA Monitor, 926 J St., Suite 1014, Sacramento, Calif. This magazine will keep readers informed about the current status of ERA passage.

IT IS ENCOURAGING to observe that as the feminist campaign continues, it has been extended to include those overlooked—the blacks, men and housewives. The feminist umbrella now includes people from all backgrounds.

If you have been an outsider, it is time to come aboard. Respect for the dignity of human beings requires that everyone share in the work that lies ahead.

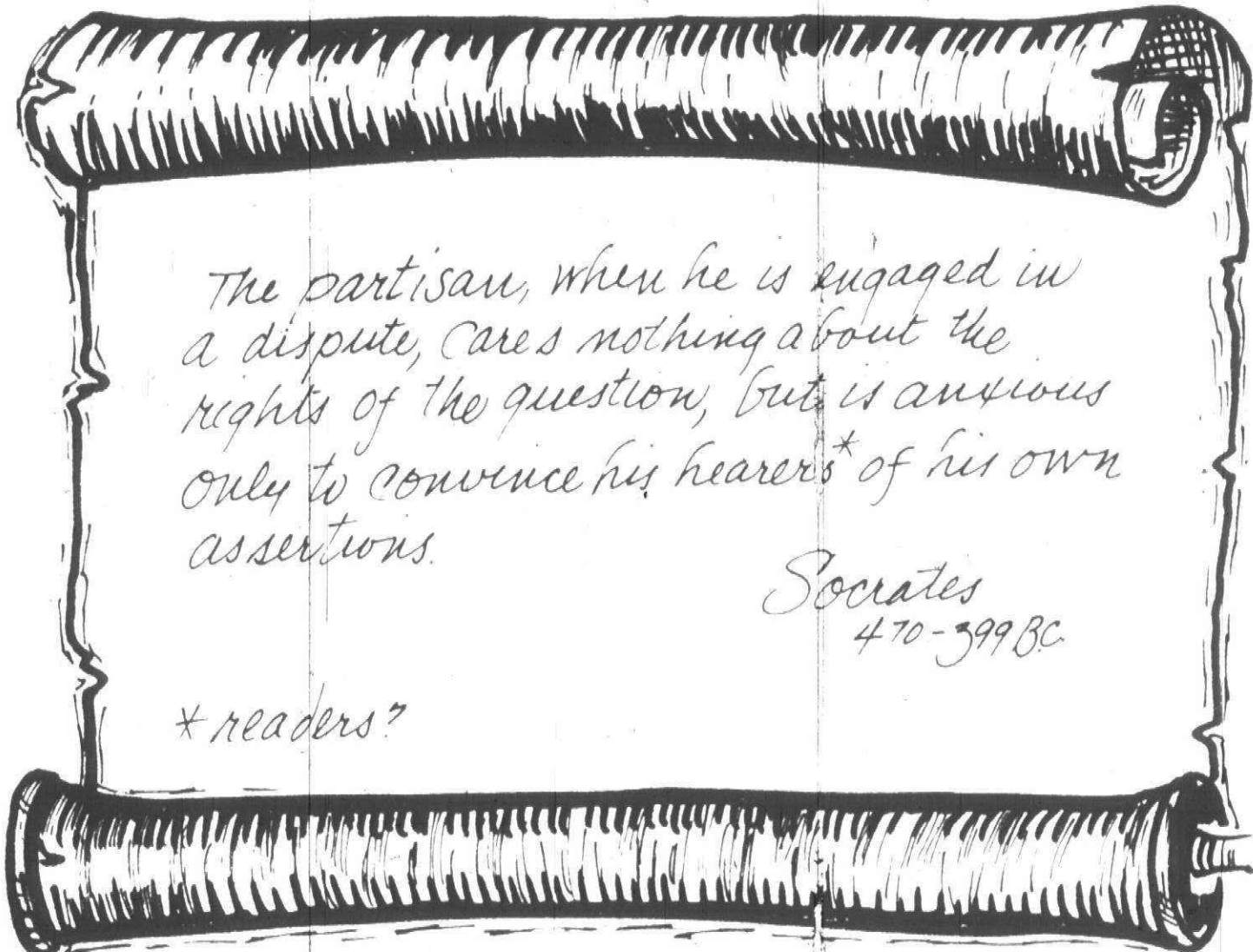

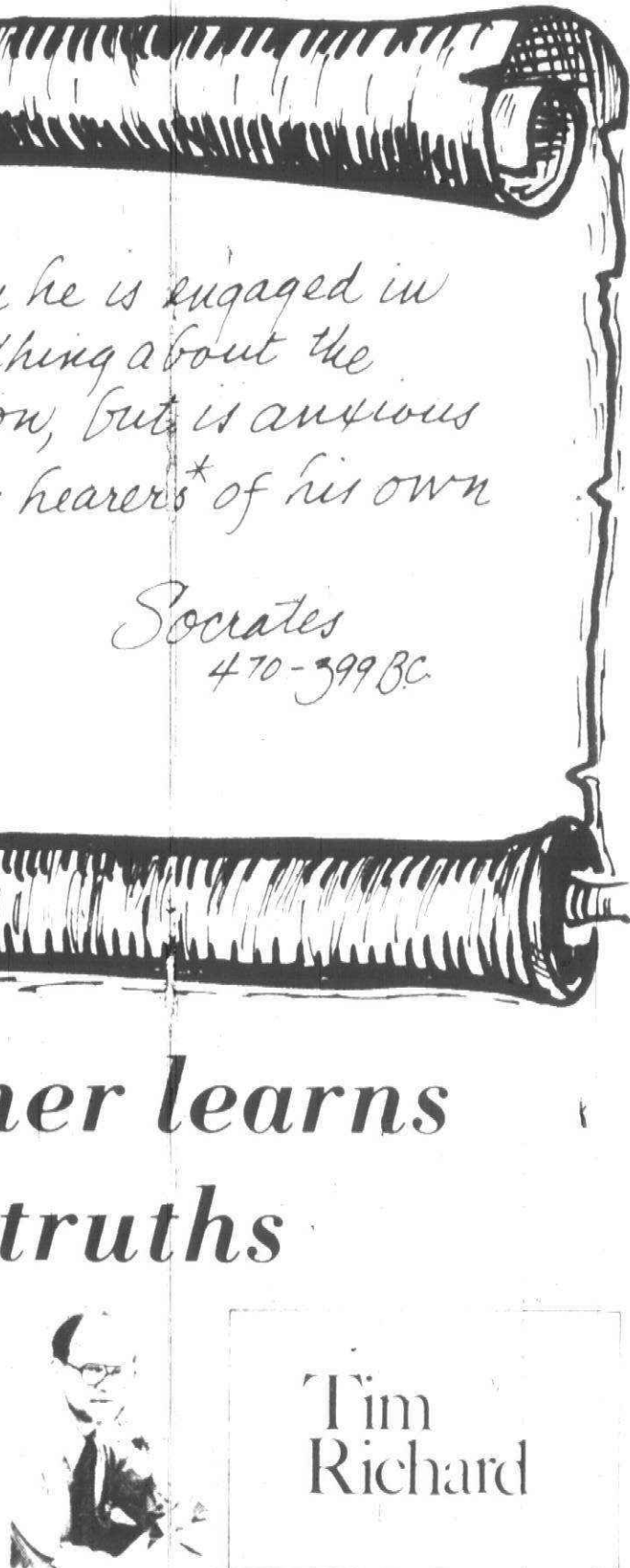

Sears moved for good reason

Bond to finance road widening

The Plymouth City Commission Monday night directed the administration to prepare a bond issue to finance acquisition of right-of-way to widen Mill and Main and Ann Arbor Trail and Mill intersections.

In 1971 the city commission authorized signing of a contract with the Wayne County Road Commission to acquire land needed to widen both intersections.

The present city commission wants to proceed with widening of Main and Mill as soon as possible because of safety hazards at that intersection. The commission, however, is unsure that the Mill-Trail intersection needs to be widened immediately.

But because the county has already obtained loan for both widening projects, and the city signed a contract in 1971, explained City Manager Fred Yockey, the city now is obliged legally to pay its share of the right-of-way costs. "This doesn't commit us yet to construction, that'll come later."

The city already has paid some \$115,000 to the county for right-of-way acquired, and will now sell bonds to obtain \$225,000 to pay the balance of its debt for land acquisition.

History in a trunk enthralls children

Groups of students or scouts who visit the Plymouth Historical Museum will leave with unforgettable impressions of life in the village of Plymouth 100 years ago.

Marjorie Mitchell's "kid-tested" recipe for making history vital and exciting evolved from years of teaching.

Take one old trunk built in 1860. Fill it with an assortment of clothing and memorabilia. Add a stock of anecdotes and tales of day-to-day life before the turn of the century.

Mrs. Mitchell's method results in an experience which involves all the senses. The children are exposed to sights, smells, textures, tastes and sounds of their great-great-grandparent's world.

"The trunk itself has an interesting history," she said. "It was made in 1860 especially for a Swedish family that was coming to this country."

AS THE TRUNK IS unpacked, one article at a time, the children learn intimate details that aren't found in history books.

They discover that everyone in the family wore nightshirts. There were no pajamas or cosy sleepers' with built-in feet.

They feel the texture of the unbleached cotton of a 19th century nightshirt.

They examine high-laced and high-buttoned shoes. A buttonhook is produced and they each take a turn at buttoning the shoes.

A long dark red dress trimmed with tan braid is removed from the trunk. There are groans from the boys and a few giggles from the girls when they learn it belonged to a little boy, and little boys wore such dresses until they were four years old.

Mrs. Mitchell shows them a pair of pants that their great-great-grandfathers could have worn to school. The straight black pants ended just below the knees, but were not knickers.

"And everyone wore hats," she

says as she displays an assortment of wide-brimmed straw hats, peaked caps and knitted stocking caps.

A VERY FANCY party dress and party shoes convinced the group that when their ancestors got dressed up, the clothes were elaborate and pretty.

They pass around a brown velvet handbag decorated with heavy beadwork and a silken tassel. This is compared to a utilitarian bag made of ordinary fabric.

Mrs. Mitchell emphasizes the Victorian fetish that "everything had to be proper, proper."

Because gentlemen had to wear clean, white collars, they suffered the stiff celluloid collars which were fastened to their shirts with collar buttons. The celluloid was easier to clean than regular fabric.

"And, of course, we have a pair of suspenders. It was the only way they had of keeping their britches up."

With buttons on everything, the children learn it took an eternity to get dressed.

AMONG THE NECESSITIES of life in the 1800s was a china invalid cup with a spout. It was used to feed persons who were too ill or too old to feed themselves.

Mrs. Mitchell said she has found that children are fascinated by sickness and death. She passes around medicinal herbs used to cure the sick. Each child sniffs the bundles of onions and garlic which were hung on doorknobs and bedposts to ward off disease. They also smell the herbs and scented geraniums.

Each is given a piece of horehound candy. They taste the amber candy that was thought to be a cure-all for many ailments.

When an old dipper is shown, Marj Mitchell explains that it was kept by the pail of drinking water and everyone used it. Today's young people are shocked by such unsanitary ways.

"Didn't they know they were pass-

ing around germs?" is the response.

They also wonder about a world with no facial tissues, plastics or aluminum foil.

AFTER THE STORIES and uses of the trunk's contents have been assimilated, they go upstairs to the Victorian rooms on the main floor of the museum.

"As we look at the three rooms, we discuss what the children's chores would be in such a household. Even though they lived in the village of Plymouth, there would be chickens to feed and cows to milk."

Mrs. Mitchell said, "Later, I hope to prepare programs which concentrate on toys and food preparation. In the fall, I hope to get together a section on the old one-room school. It

should be interesting. I'll explain the strict disciplinary actions which were necessary because the pupils were so old and the teachers so young."

Groups wishing to take advantage of history in a trunk can call the museum to arrange a time. The program has been adapted to the year 1927 for

students of Starkweather Elementary School. Classes will visit the museum this week as part of the school's 50th anniversary celebration.

"The program starts the minute they hit the door," said Mrs. Mitchell. "Every child leaves there with something they won't forget."

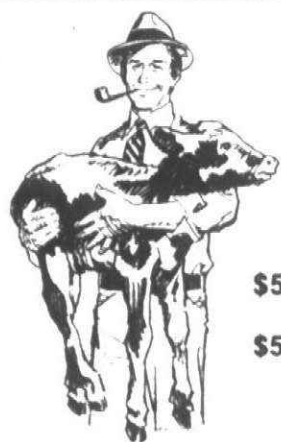

No-fault divorce law brings its own set of new problems

"With the passage of the no-fault divorce law we now find ourselves in the midst of a damaging backlash in regard to the position of women in domestic relations cases."

Speaking is Maxine Virtue, an Ann Arbor attorney, a lecturer at the University of Michigan-Dearborn during Women Recognition Week.

"We have really been surprised by developments in this field," she said.

The law was supposed to avoid warfare between the spouses by limiting the divorce action to the single issue of the viability of the marriage, but it has not worked out that way, she indicated.

"There seems to be some psychological need in a divorce for a ritual bloodletting, or public ceremony to end the marriage," she said. "Before they fought in court over the fault issue. Now we find the same fighting over property, child custody and child support, issues we used to be able to settle more easily negotiating with the client behind the scenes."

"The Michigan Supreme Court hasn't helped by ruling that the concept of fault applies in property, custody and support cases."

MRS. VIRTUE, who has been practicing law for 42 years, has noticed another change brought about by no-fault.

"It is suddenly no longer culturally intolerable for a man to seek a divorce. It has even become fashionable. About 60 per cent of my clients are men."

"They are insisting on custody of the children and getting it as a matter of course. In a half dozen cases in the

last two years, I've known of women receiving papers advising them they are being sued for divorce, and informing them of restraining orders giving the husband custody of the kids and cutting them off from support."

WHERE THE GOING gets tough, the speaker said, is when the dependent wife has been a 110 per cent wife and mother for 20-30 years.

"She is psychologically honed in on her man as the protector," she said. "This woman says he has taken care of me for 30 years and wouldn't do anything against me. At the same time she is looking at a paper giving him custody and her no money."

"Right to the final day it is a problem for her attorney to get through this woman's head what is happening. What she needs is a marriage counselor to get her in a psychological frame of mind to fight for her rights. She will have to get an attorney to fight for her on custody, property and pension rights."

The wife's labor at home is not easily evaluated in dollars. "How do you place an hourly rate on a devoted wife and mother?" asked Mrs. Virtue. "But if I were her attorney, you could be pretty sure, she would not come out with nothing."

Another worry for the woman is the plan offered by her husband to pay tuition for her at a community college, rather than pay alimony, so she can learn job skills and be able to live alone.

"This type of women will find it difficult to enter the labor market," she said. "If she is 40 or 50, she may not have the habit of mind to do it. But if she doesn't, she'll have to persuade the judge to give her support alimony

to take care of her the rest of her life."

IN HER OPINION it is the duty of a judge to hear and decide divorce cases. She is not happy by a plan "run past Wayne County judges to have members of the American Arbitration Association make property settlements in divorces, with their awards final and binding."

"I think that's a terrible idea," she declared. "I think it is the judge's job to deal with the case because property, alimony, custody and child support are all intertwined."

"Unless the decision is made in connection with these factors, the woman

will come out with a fraction of the property settlement."

"Besides, while she may be a devoted wife and mother, she may not be clever enough to with negotiate with a skilled arbitrator from the AAA."

"Dice are liable to be loaded in the direction of her husband. I see this as another instance of the difficulties a woman can encounter."

Mrs. Virtue sees no hope in getting rid of the no-fault divorce law. "What we need to do is move toward a family court where all aspects of the families in litigation can be dealt with knowledgeably," she concluded.

Kathy is publicity co-chairwoman for Promenade the Past 1977, a public tour of six historic structures in downtown Tecumseh, Mich., to be held May 21 and 22. Also in Tecumseh on May 22 only is the Al Meyers Airport Dawn Patrol, sponsored by the Tecumseh Jaycees and Jaycee Auxiliary.

The two events promise an entertaining and educational experience for the entire family.

The promenade historic tour will include three private homes, a Greek Revival, Queen Anne and Italianate villa style homes modeled after an English castle, the First United Presbyterian Church built in 1865 and completely restored, a Federal style home restored as the August Co., flower and bath boutique and a cobblestone mission, once the first Catholic church in Tecumseh now restored as the Richard Marks Stained Glass Studio and Gallery.

All the buildings are in Tecumseh's historic district on M-50 and were registered on the Michigan Register of Historic Sites in 1976.

Demonstrations such as sheep shearing and stained glass designing will be held at each stop to give visitors a glimpse of life in the once 19th century country town.

The Dawn Patrol begins with a public breakfast at 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. Pilots from Michigan, Indiana, Ohio and surrounding regions have been invited to fly in.

Chicken barbecue will be at 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Antique autos and experimental aircraft will be displayed, as well as over 50 arts and crafts.

Parachuting will be demonstrated. The OX-5 aviation pioneers and the Michigan 99's women pilots will meet in Tecumseh on Sunday. Admission to airport is free.

THE PROMENADE is sponsored by the Tecumseh Area Historical Society, Presbyterian Women's Association and the Tecumseh Chamber of Commerce. Advance tickets are \$2 or \$2.50 on tour. Students and senior citizens are \$1. For advance tickets readers may write the historical society, P.O. Box 26, Tecumseh, Mich. 49286.

To get to Tecumseh, travel U.S. 12 west to Clinton, turn left at the stop light and travel four miles south on Tecumseh-Clinton Road to the airport.

The promenade begins at the First Presbyterian Church, 211 W. Chicago Blvd. (M-50) and is from 1-6 p.m., May 21 and 22. All events are rain or shine.

Kathy is editor-reporter for the Tecumseh Herald. Her husband, Mike, is a consultant for Burroughs in Detroit and is a fulltime student at the University of Michigan. He is working on his doctor's degree in electrical engineering. The Browns moved to Canton in March 1976.

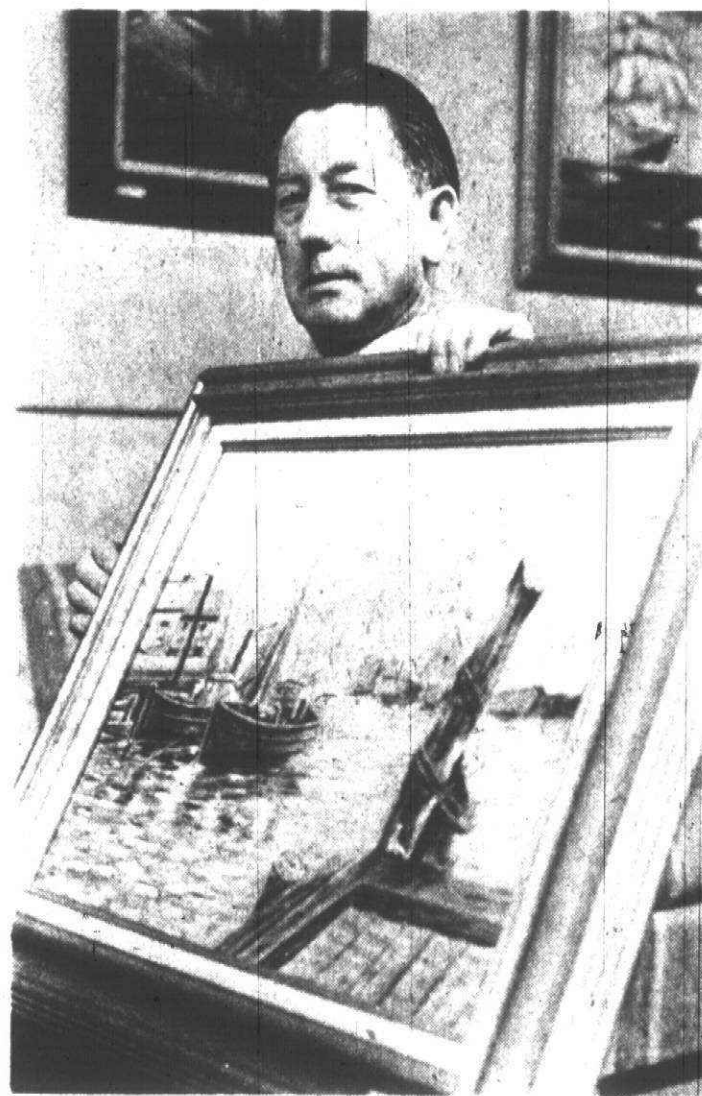

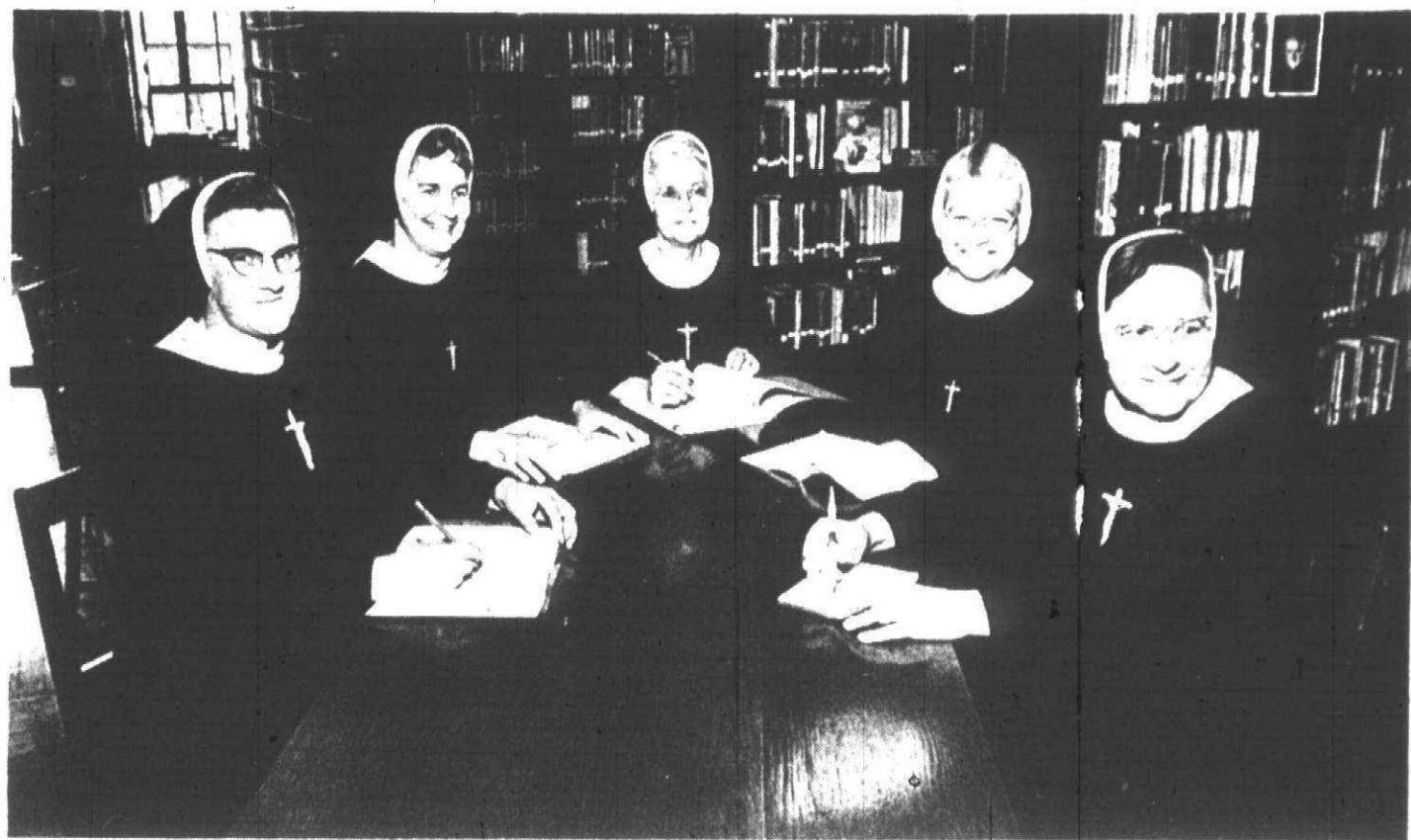
In taking over as the new head of the Province, Mother Clarentine let it be known that she wants to take an active interest in all areas of the Province, as well as in community affairs.

Summit offers more than just skyline

Crowning the 73-story Detroit Plaza Hotel is The Summit, the world's largest rooftop, counter-rotating restaurant-lounge complex. It offers an

ever-changing 360-degree view of two nations (Detroit and Windsor, Canada), the Detroit River, Belle Isle, Lake St. Clair—and beyond.

The view begins as guests walk into one of two exterior glass-enclosed elevators that whisk them directly to the rooftop complex. Rising along the riverside of the Hotel Tower, the elevators are accessible from the Ontario Level, the third level of the hotel's eight-story atrium.

Luncheon entrees, which average \$6, include Le Paté En Croute Fontaine, a veal pate with brandy and port wine enveloped in a golden crust and served with Cumberland Sauce, and Crepes Bengale, thin French crepes filled with curried chicken and served with Chinese pea-pods and water chestnuts.

Highlights of the dinner entrees, which average \$9, are Veal Scallopini Sabatini, milk-fed veal sautéed with chicken liver and diced tomato in marsala sauce; Lobster Benedict, broiled rock lobster tail with poached eggs on an English muffin glazed with hollandaise sauce; and Sirloin Steak Colbert, a broiled New York cut steak served with herbed butter, grilled tomato and pea pods.

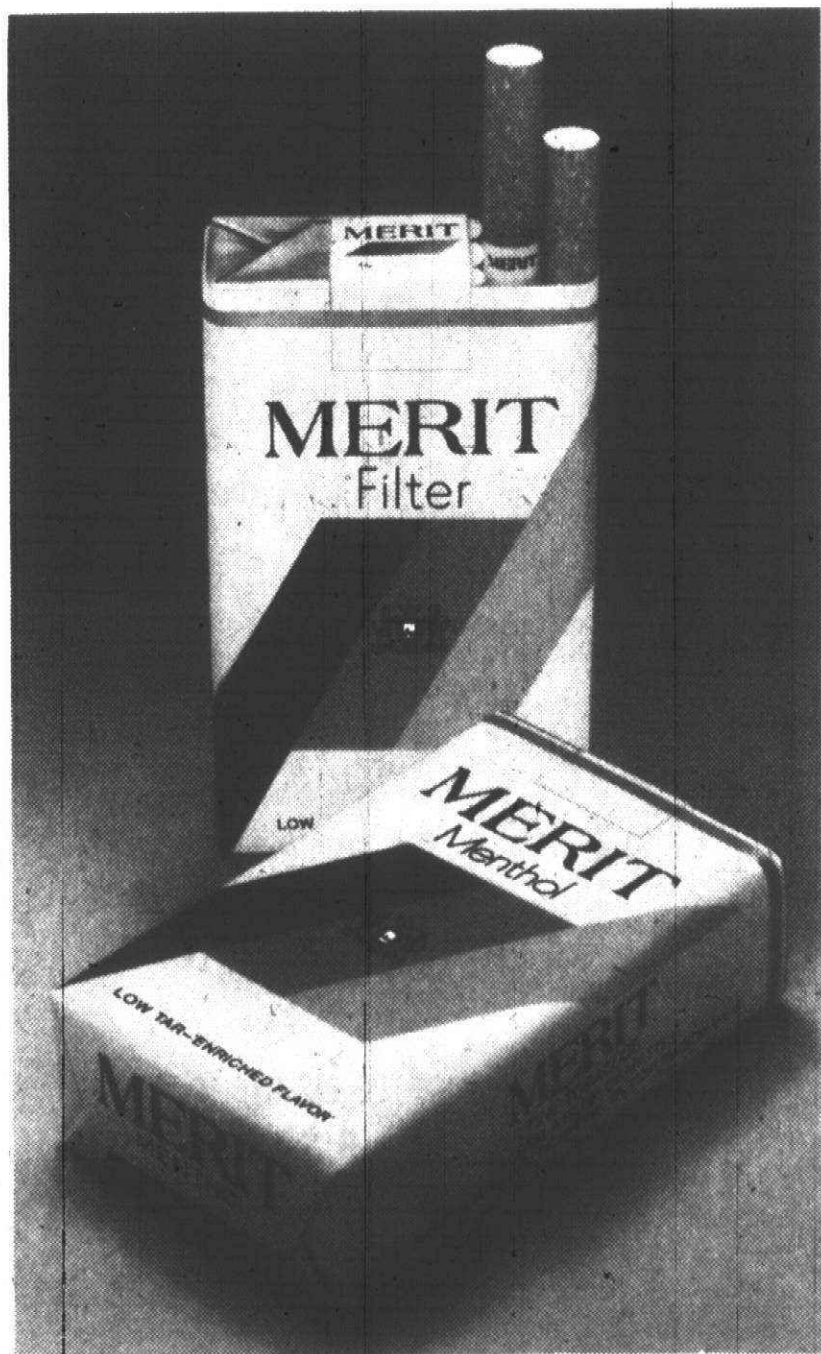

Two walks loaded the bases, and a wild pitch scored Britton with the winning run.

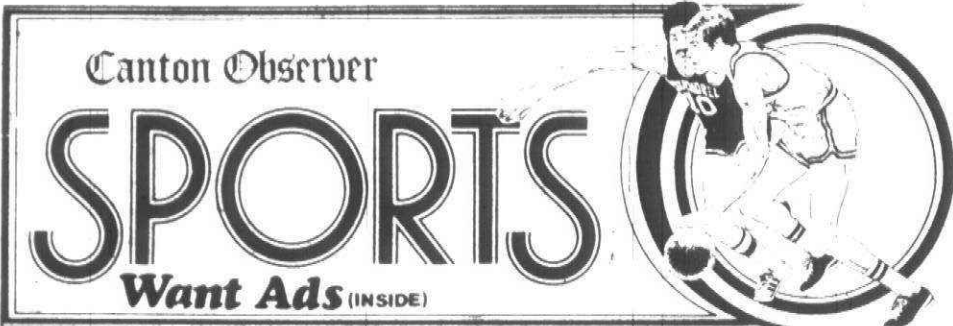
Smith went all the way on the mound for the victory. He struck out 10 and allowed only four hits.

Canton recorded nine hits but was aided with 15 base on balls by the Churchill pitching.

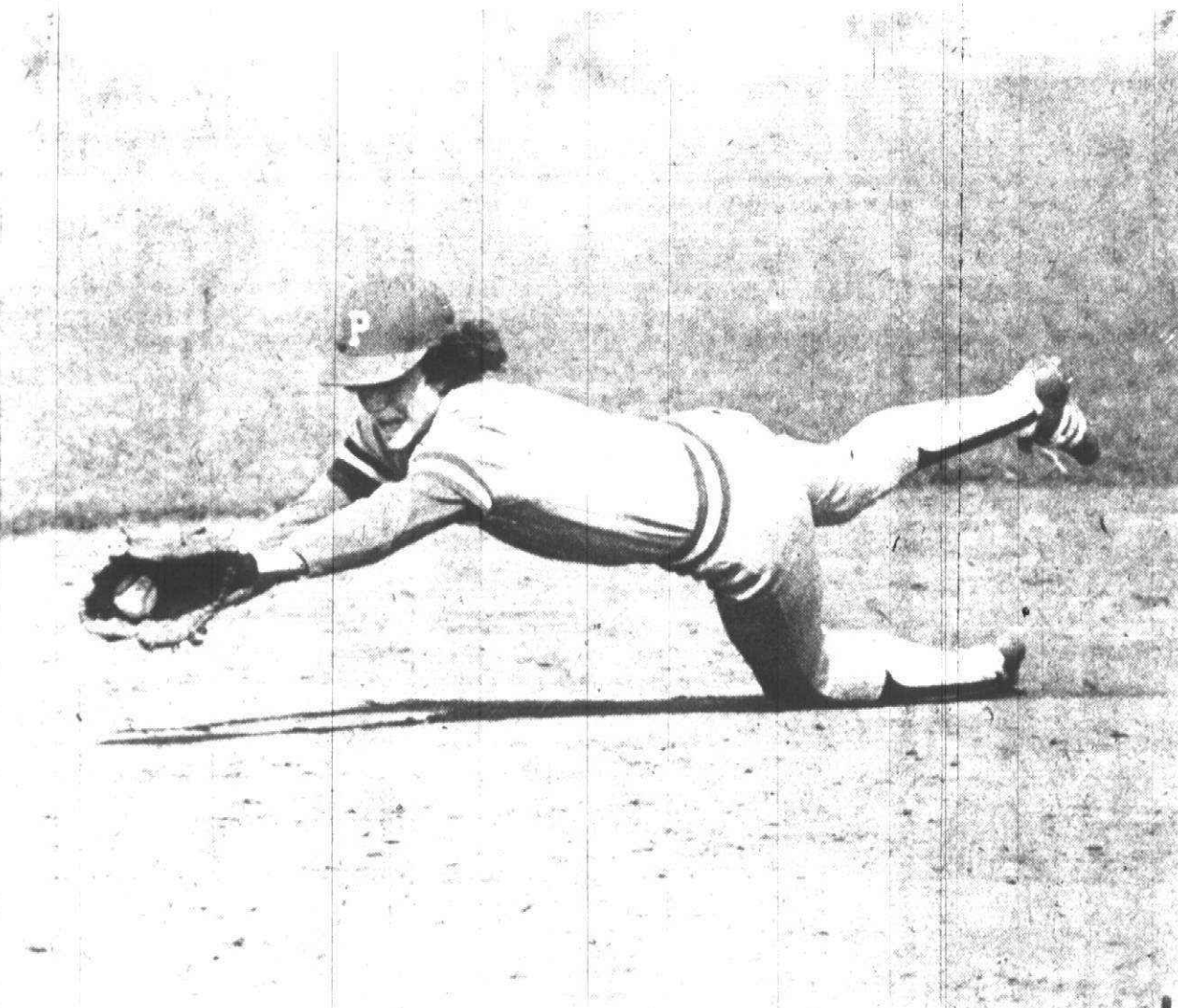
Howe started and gave up three quick runs in the first inning, but settled down and went the rest of the way to get the victory.

Salem coach Gary Balcom, who never imagined the fund-raiser would be such a financial success, thanked everyone for taking part in the community effort.

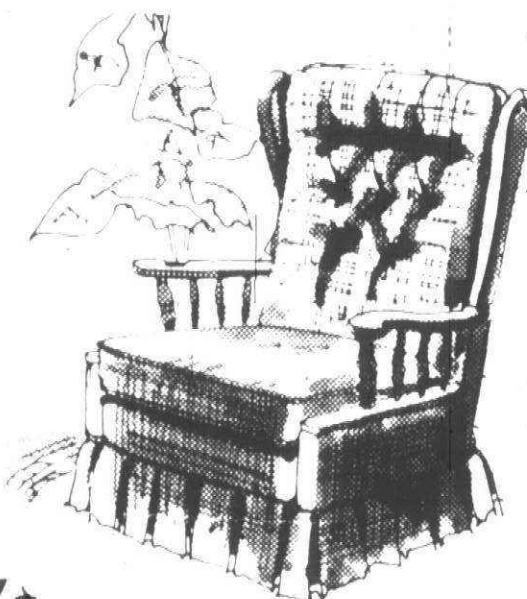
"It was great," Balcom said. "It was truly a community effort. We had over 70 people working for seven straight hours washing cars."

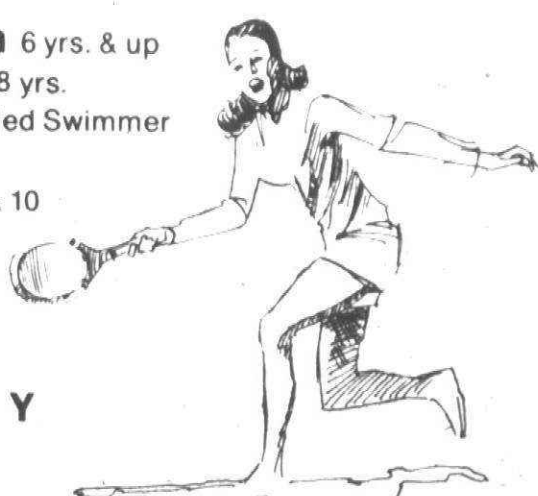

CEP boys set for Observer track relays

With a host of state-ranked trackmen competing this Saturday in the seventh annual Observerland Relays, it seems only logical to conclude several meet records could be shattered.

That's the opinion of Redford Union coach John MacKenzie, who is directing the meet, scheduled for Hilbert Jr. High, 26440 Puritan between Five and Six Mile.

"I think we'll see some of the best performances ever," said MacKenzie. "I wouldn't be surprised to see four of the five field event records fall and two or three running events, if the weather cooperates."

The weather is the key because the track at Hilbert is cinder and general-

ly not as fast as asphalt or tartan surfaces.

Farmington squad will probably battle it out for the championship, with RU looming as an outside threat depending on how well it does in the field events.

Other challengers include Garden City West and East, Redford Thurston, Redford Union, Plymouth Canton and Salem, Farmington, Farmington Harrison, Southfield-Lathrup, Livonia Bentley and Northville.

Many outstanding athletes will showcase their talents for the crowd, which is expected to number a couple thousand.

Churchill's Dave Kilty and Kevin Chapel are among the premier discus

throwers and high jumpers, respectively, in the state.

Bob Babits and brother Paul, from RU, both sparkle in the pole vault, while Ron Cwik and Nick Cipriano, from Borgess, can compete with the best in the hurdles and sprints.

Franklin, like Churchill, has a balanced reserve of talent headed by sprinters Dave Bowen and Phil Yuhasz.

Several outstanding middle-distance runners, such as Bill Rowley, from Stevenson, Mike Miller, North Farmington, Walt White, Salem, and Mark Boyd, Garden City West, will also clash.

The lengthier relays will feature the likes of Tobin Jones, Churchill, Kurt Reynolds, Thurston, Hugh Leidlein and Stu Glatfelter, Farmington, Bill Wilkin, Stevenson, and Jeff Perrine, Garden City East.

Other premier trackmen expected to participate are Craig Fuelling, Bentley, Jeff Goforth, Southfield-Lathrup, Mike Bowden, Mark Evans and Charlie Rogers, all from Harrison, Kevin Hansen, Farmington, and Mike Skone, from Salem.

"Nobody's going to run away with the championship," said Churchill coach Fred Price.

Competition begins at 2 p.m. with

the pole vault, which will likely continue well into the meet. The discus and shot put get underway at 3 p.m., the high jump at 3:30 p.m. and the long jump at 4 p.m.

The running events will begin at 7 p.m. with the four-mile relay, followed by the 880-yard relay, two-mile relay, distance-medley relay, sprint-medley relay, shuttle-hurdle relay, 440-yard relay and mile relay.

Scoring is based on a 5-4-3-2-1 point system. An individual may participate in a maximum of four events.

Wolverine action

Beatrice Farber, a former Michigan legal secretary who has become one of harness racing's "bionic women," has added another world speed record to Wolverine Raceway's growing collection.

Slapping the reins on her 5-year-old gelding Quick Command recently before a crowd of nearly 10,000, Farber won the featured \$10,000 Invitational Pace with a race time of 1:57.4. The two-length victory was the fastest mile ever posted by a woman driver in the history of the sport.

"The amazing thing is that Quick Command could have made it even faster if we'd had to," said Farber after the record mile. "When I pulled him out wide at the head of the stretch he almost jerked me from the sulky."

The U.S. Trotting Association in Columbus, Ohio, confirmed that the pacing mile was a new women's world record, erasing the previous mark of 1:59.1 also set by Farber in January at California's Bay Meadows. No other woman has even come close to Farber's record.

Actually, the historic victory by Quick Command just put the frosting on a tremendous start being made by Farber at Wolverine this spring. Only a few days before, she had started five horses over a three-night race period and won all five races. Purses for those five events had totaled \$24,800.

"I still say that every success we enjoy is mainly due to the tender lov-

ing care we give our horses," said Farber of the 15-horse stable owned and supervised by her and her trainer-husband Charles.

"We van them back to our farm in Brighton after every race and just turn them loose for a couple of days."

Born 36 years ago in Kinsey, Mich., Farber now holds just about every women's record in the sport. When she won the track driving championship at Northville Downs in 1973, she became the first and only woman ever to win the crown at a major track.

Her achievements on the track brought her the invitation to compete in international women's competition in Italy last summer, and she has engaged in colorful "match races" against leading male drivers at tracks throughout America.

"My husband and I just simply love horses and we think we know what makes them tick on a race track," said Farber. "I even talk to them during a race, and right now no one can argue that such conversation is useless. They sure seem to be paying attention."

Winning the first race she ever drove, at the county fair in Bay City after her husband had broken his arm and asked her to sit in for him, Farber quickly became the woman to be reckoned with on a race track. She has won nearly 300 races at pari-mutuel tracks and her horses have accumulated race earnings of more than half-million dollars.

Stevenson hosts Special Olympics

The final week of Special Olympic competition will be held Friday at Livonia Stevenson High School.

The Special Olympics is an athletic program made available to 1,800 area mentally and physically handicapped persons: The ultimate goal of the Special Olympics program is to create opportunities for sports training and athletic competition for all handicapped people.
