History repeated in grim irony

Crane accident kills worker

For the second time in less than six years Kenneth Kennedy heard the tragic news that a son of his was killed in a crane accident at a building site.

Chuck D. Kennedy, 23, of 20073 Sunset, Livonia, was crushed between a construction crane's revolving counterweight and frame at approximately 11 a.m. Friday morning in Canton's Sunflower subdivision.

The grim irony of the incident is the fact that the young man's father works as a crane operator for the same company. Acitelli and Peterman Poured Wall Co. of Farmington. In 1971 Doug Kennedy, Chuck's older brother, was electrocuted operating a crane that touched high voltage wires.

The eldest Kennedy was present at the building site in the 1971 fatality. Friday morning he was working in another city.

Co-workers of Chuck Kennedy explained that Louis Lindsay, the crane operator at the Canton building site, started to unload wooden panels off the truck at Lot 619 on Chichester street when the accident happened.

"Louie looked out of the cab and saw a group of us standing a good distance away," said Willie Lindsay, brother of the operator of the crane that killed "Kennedy."

"HE SWUNG THE COUNTERWEIGHT — which is on the back of the crane around because we were starting to unload the frames off truck in the street. He (Chuck) was done parking the truck and started walking toward the crane."

"They did it so quick I don't think any of us know exactly how it all happened. But somebody saw him going toward the crane and yelled to stop it. Louie did but it was already too late."

Willie Lindsay said he saw no signs of careless behavior or negligence by either Kennedy or the crane operator. No one was placing blame on anyone in the incident.

Members of the Kennedy family were at Wayne County General Hospital Friday afternoon to identify the body. Dr. Glenn Hamilton made efforts to revive Kennedy but pronounced him dead at 11:26 a.m.

Later in the day family members contacted Chuck Kennedy's fiancée, Jean Miles of Redford, to tell her the news. No date had been set for the pair's wedding, but the two had already informed family and friends of their engagement.

Sheriff detectives who responded to the call wondered if the death could have been prevented if the crane had been equipped with a buzzer or beeper that would go on when the counterweight is revolving.

Wayne County Sheriff Det. Walter Holowka said he found no signs of unsafe machinery or procedure in an investigation of the job site.

"It one of those horrible on-the-job accidents that can happen," said Holowka.

CANTON TOWNSHIP rescue unit rushed the injured man to Wayne County General Hospital in six minutes.

utes time. They arrived at the hospital at 11:10 and Dr. Hamilton tried in vain for 15 minutes to revive the man.

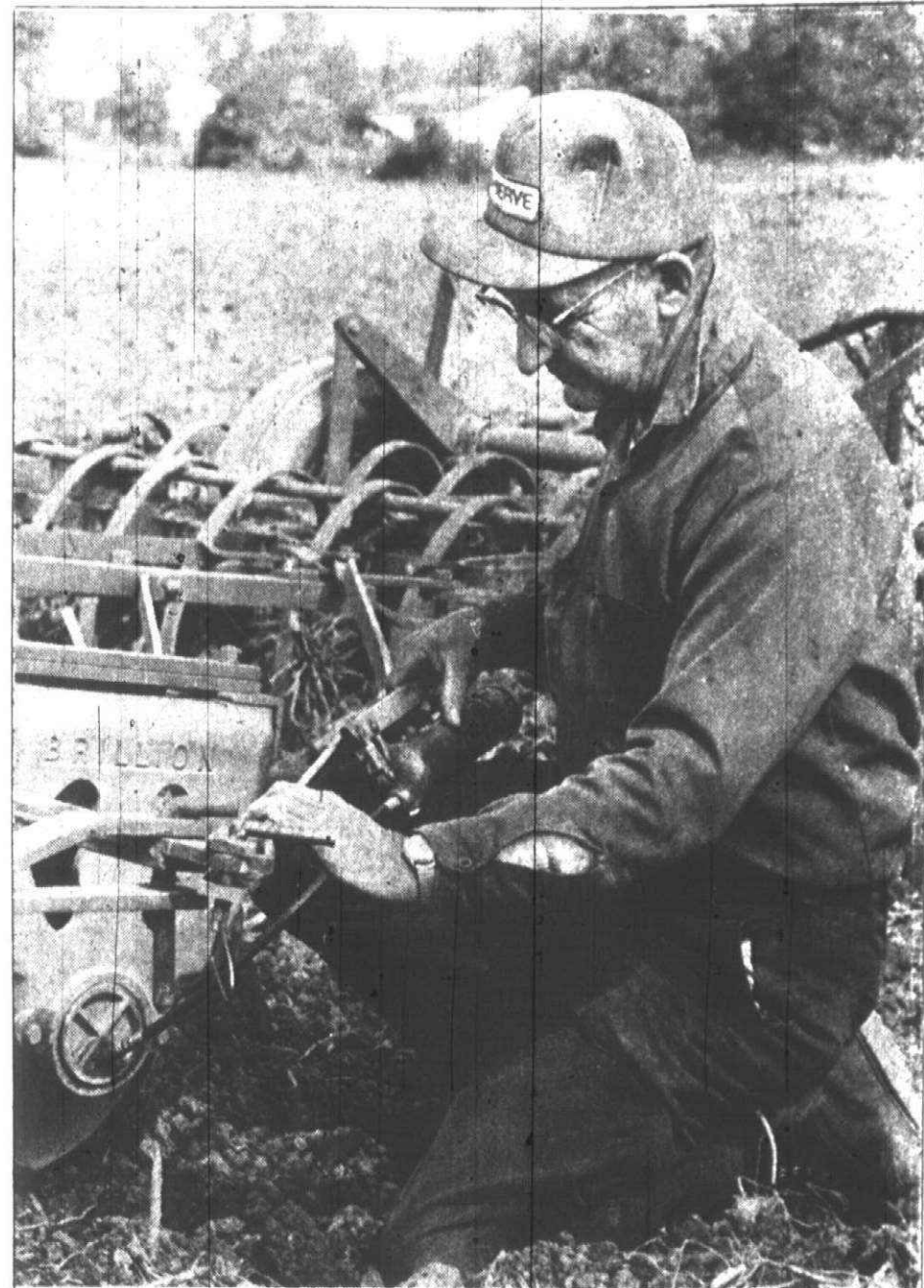
Police reported that Kennedy's head, shoulders and chest were fractured and cut severely in the accident.

The counterweight apparently pinned Kennedy against the frame which has a six-inch clearance below the counterweight.

Kennedy lived at home with his parents and had attended Clarenceville High School in Livonia before leaving to work in the construction field.

He is survived by his parents, Kenneth and Ellen; sisters, Donna, 24, Kathy, 19, and Pam, 14; brothers, Frank, 12 and Michael, 11; and a grandmother, Mrs. Martha Grose of Livonia.

Funeral arrangements have not been finalized but they will be handled by Thayer Funeral Home in Livonia.

School board officials jockey for presidency

Within the next two weeks school trustees will informally attempt to reach consensus on whom to elect as president of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The organizational meeting at which officers are formally elected will be Friday evening, July 1. But, if past years are any indication, each trustee will reach a decision on how to vote before the gavel is sounded at the organizational meeting.

The telephone caucusing hadn't started yet during the first week after the school board election, but an informal survey of the Observer of trustees indicated a consensus might already exist.

Although no one has announced a desire to serve as board president, most trustees felt that Marcia Borowski's name would be the first to be nominated. The survey didn't indicate, however, that her election as board president is at this time a foregone conclusion.

It is possible she might garner as many as five votes for the chairmanship.

MS. BOROWSKI sought the board presidency last year but lost by a 4-3 vote of the board.

The election Monday of Steve Harper to the board replacing E.J. McClendon makes it possible for Ms. Borowski to gain the four votes she needs this year for the presidency. Harper, though, remains uncommitted about whom he would support for the position.

Harper rules himself out as a candidate for the position because of his freshman status on the board. Another trustee, though, says Harper shouldn't be counted out and points out that McClendon was elected board president his first year as a trustee.

Board President Joe Gray told the Observer he didn't want to be considered as president again because of pressing business commitments on his time.

And Gray doesn't see himself as the most likely compromise candidate in case Ms. Borowski is unable to line up a majority of four votes. He didn't rule out accepting the post as a compromise, but felt it was very unlikely.

George Lawton and Tom Yack both indicated they aren't interested in the board presidency, but neither would go so far as to say they would refuse to take the job under any circumstances.

Flossie Tonda removed herself as a candidate for the job and said she would not accept the post under any circumstance.

Dick Arlen also is not seeking the position because of the time com-

will continue. All want to avoid the public backbiting which occurred at last year's organizational meeting.

Thus, the major factor likely will be each trustee's individual perception of Ms. Borowski's potential to unify the board.

Although the advocacy issue is a concern of a couple trustees, the major roadblock for Ms. Borowski appears to be the unification question.

IN CASE Ms. Borowski is unable to convince some of her supporters she has the potential to unify the board, the four-vote majority tally could quickly evaporate. If that occurs, her

mittments of his job, but wouldn't rule out the option of accepting it as a compromise candidate.

Of all the compromise candidates though—Arlen, Yack, Lawton, Gray—each express an unwillingness to accept the responsibility. Gray and Lawton, especially, are very anxious to avoid the position and by July 1 are apt to decide against allowing themselves even to be used as compromise candidates.

THE NOTION OF a compromise candidate kept coming up in discussion with trustees because of the feelings of some trustees that Ms. Borowski may not be the best person for the chair.

The two major concerns held are: that she may be unable to provide the leadership needed to unify the board for more effectiveness; and, that she may be unable to maintain a more or less neutral position and avoid assuming an advocacy role for programs of special interest to her.

At this point, the board especially is interested in working as a unified group even though split votes based on different perspectives on the issues

name may never reach the nomination stage.

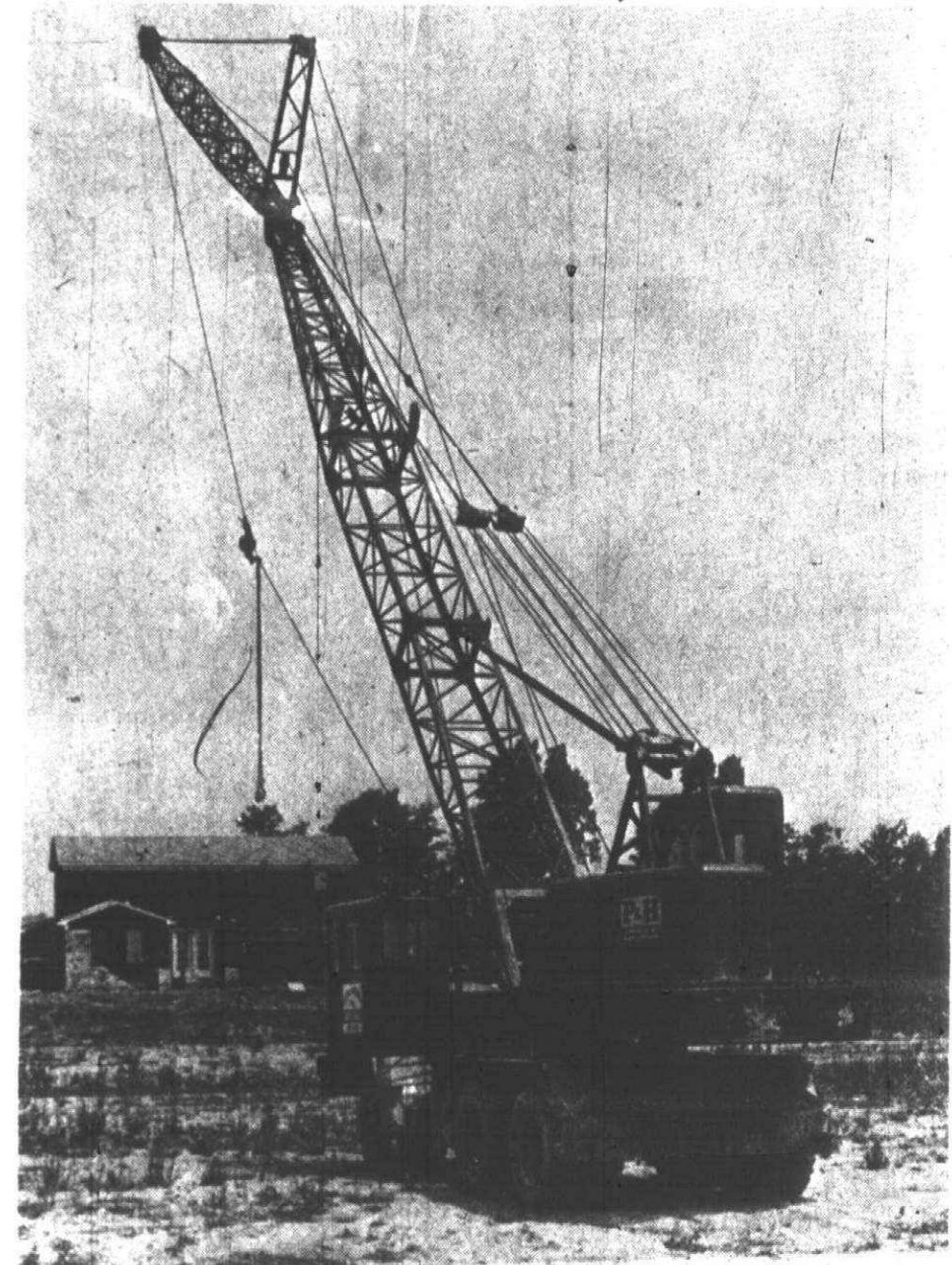
In that event, one of the "unwilling compromise" candidates may be pushed to the forefront. The name most likely to surface is Yack, who most trustees feel is likely to receive a unanimous vote.

Yack personally considers himself an unlikely candidate because of time commitments of his job and because he doesn't intend to run again for the school board. Other trustees, though, don't share Yack's assessment.

ANOTHER FACTOR influencing the decision could be the length of service each trustee has and whether each trustee has served as chairman before.

Of the seven trustees, only Gray and Lawton have served as chairman. This year's vice-chairman was McClendon, so there won't be any "stepping up" into the chairmanship.

Both Lawton and Ms. Borowski will be up for election next June. Yack and Gray's terms expire the following year, then Mrs. Tonda and Arlen, with Harper having a full four-years ahead.

Brown talks secession for a 'Suburbia' county

Although there probably won't be a civil war, there are more than a couple people who would like to see the western section of Wayne County literally secede from the rest of "Detroit-dominated" Wayne County.

Rep. Tom Brown (D-Westland) is one of those people, and he is in a position to do something about it. He plans to introduce legislation in the State House of Representatives which

would set the stage for a vote on splitting Wayne County into two separate counties.

Brown would like the new county to be called "Suburbia."

"I think it's a good idea," he said. "And I think it's time the people got a chance to vote on the question."

He said the legislation should be ready by mid-summer.

Brown feels that the out-county com-

munities have been getting "short changed" on many community services and are not getting their fair share of representation.

To bolster his argument he points at a number of recent county decisions. First on his list is the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority's (SEMTA) plans for a metropolitan transportation system which, Brown said, ignores western Wayne County.

Knife cuts self-inflicted?

Police are investigating a young woman's complaint that she was slashed by a razor-wielding black man in the restroom of Hardee's Restaurant last week. But Plymouth Chief Tim Ford says he is "having trouble accepting the woman's story."

The woman, 17, an employee of the restaurant, told police she went into the restroom to change into her work uniform and was grabbed by a black male who slashed her hands, face and forearms with a razor.

She described her alleged assailant as six feet tall, about 170 pounds, wearing a black shirt, blue jeans and a blue jean jacket.

She was treated for her wounds by the Plymouth Fire Department and

was taken to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia.

Two other employees present in the restaurant at the time of the alleged slashing told police they had not seen anyone fitting the woman's description, nor had they heard anything out of the ordinary.

"I HAVE TO ACCEPT the story on face value," said Ford. "but I have serious trouble with certain aspects of it."

"There's no question that the cuts were real. But the questions we've asked so far have received unsatisfactory answers."

Ford said part of his doubt stemmed from the fact that the other restaurant employees did not see the

alleged assailant. The restroom is located inside the building, and the only way to get to it is from the front of the restaurant.

"From what I understand, it would have been very difficult for anyone to go to the restroom without being noticed and then get out again."

"Also, it strikes me as odd that the woman did not scream when she was cut with the blade."

The woman told police she had tried to escape, but the alleged assailant threatened to harm the other employees if she ran.

"We are investigating the story given to us by the alleged victim," said Ford, "and she has consented to take a polygraph test."

Walker School to get 9 new rooms

Wayne-Westland Community School District voters, who approved a \$19.6 million bond issue last year, will soon be able to see how that money is being used.

About \$382,000 of it will be used for construction of storage buildings at each of the 19 elementary schools as well as at the junior high schools.

Not yet budgeted but in the planning stages are a nature center building to be constructed on the site of

the Cleveland Elementary School at Palmer and Wildwood which was destroyed by fire last year, and an addition to the Walker Elementary School on Michigan Avenue, which includes Canton students.

Tom Blacklock, department superintendent for operations of the school district, said a general storage building will be constructed on a site at Myrtle and Howe in Wayne while the buildings planned for the schools will be used for storing flammable liquids

and power mowers.

"The storage buildings for the elementary schools will be of reinforced concrete block with a poured cement roof, hopefully to make them vandal proof," said Blacklock. "They will be 10 by 15-foot overall."

"The junior high buildings will be 15 by 24 feet and built of the same material," he added.

Some of the storage buildings may be attached to the existing structures, but primarily they will be detached.

"The idea of the storage areas is to keep flammable material out of the school buildings."

"We hope to get started on this project within 30 days and have the complete program wrapped up before winter," said Blacklock.

Nine classrooms will be added to Walker Elementary School, to be completed by September of next year.

The preliminary drawings of the addition have been approved by the school board.

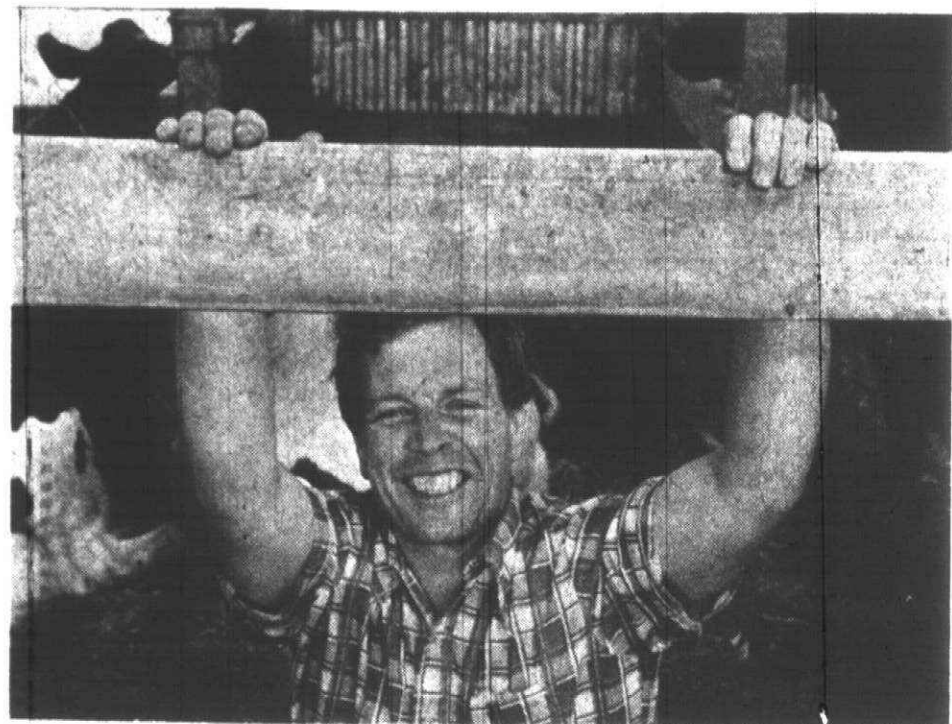
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Farming at buck an hour

Fritz's wallet gettin' thinner

Fritz Lobbestael maneuvered his tractor through a field at Beck and Geddes breaking up clumps of clay.

At last year's soybean and field corn prices, the work will probably net the Canton farmer about \$1 an hour for a growing season packed with 12-hour days.

"Farming boils down to simple economics," mused Lobbestael as he leaned on his tractor and tossed a cigarette on his newly-fitted field. "The trouble is farming in Canton often doesn't measure up."

Last year, Lobbestael figures he made just over \$1 an hour for growing soybeans and field corn on his 160 acres. The cash grain crop netted only \$2,060 after taxes, seeds, fertilizer and other supplies were subtracted from the gross total.

"Most of us farmers say we'll farm until we go broke," said Lobbestael as he squinted in the sun. "Every year a lot of farmers wonder how they can make it another year."

"If I didn't have my retirement check from Ford's, I certainly couldn't afford farming on a full-time basis."

A MEMBER OF Canton's recently-convened land use study committee, Lobbestael feels something must be done if active farmland is to remain in Canton Township.

In a recommendation to the township board, committee members endorsed a reduced tax rate for farmers, establishment of an agricultural zoning district, and public purchase of farmers' development rights.

Lobbestael places much of the blame for the farmers' economic plight on the high rate of taxation in Canton Township.

Taxes in Canton, he noted, range from \$40 to \$100 an acre on agricultural land. Taxes in rural Washtenaw and Livingston counties are as low as \$8 an acre in some areas.

A major reason for high tax rates, Lobbestael noted, is high land values. Agricultural land in Canton ranges from \$2,200 to \$5,500 an acre, depending on the proximity to developed lands. In 1976, agricultural land in Washtenaw County ranged from \$175 to \$1,500 an acre, while the average cost of farmland statewide was only \$672 an acre.

Lobbestael, who farmed only part-time until his retirement from Ford Motor Co. three years ago, keeps his head "barely above water" by renting additional land at \$10 to \$15 an acre each growing season.

The owner of the land pays \$100 an acre in property taxes each year. Ac-

cording to Lobbestael, cash from a one-acre crop does not even near the \$100 mark.

"If I couldn't rent land at less than \$25 an acre, I'd be operating at a loss," said Lobbestael, who owns 40 acres at Geddes and Napier.

ALTHOUGH CANTON farmers pay a relatively high tax rate, they do not receive any more money for their crops at the marketplace than farmers who pay a lower tax rate.

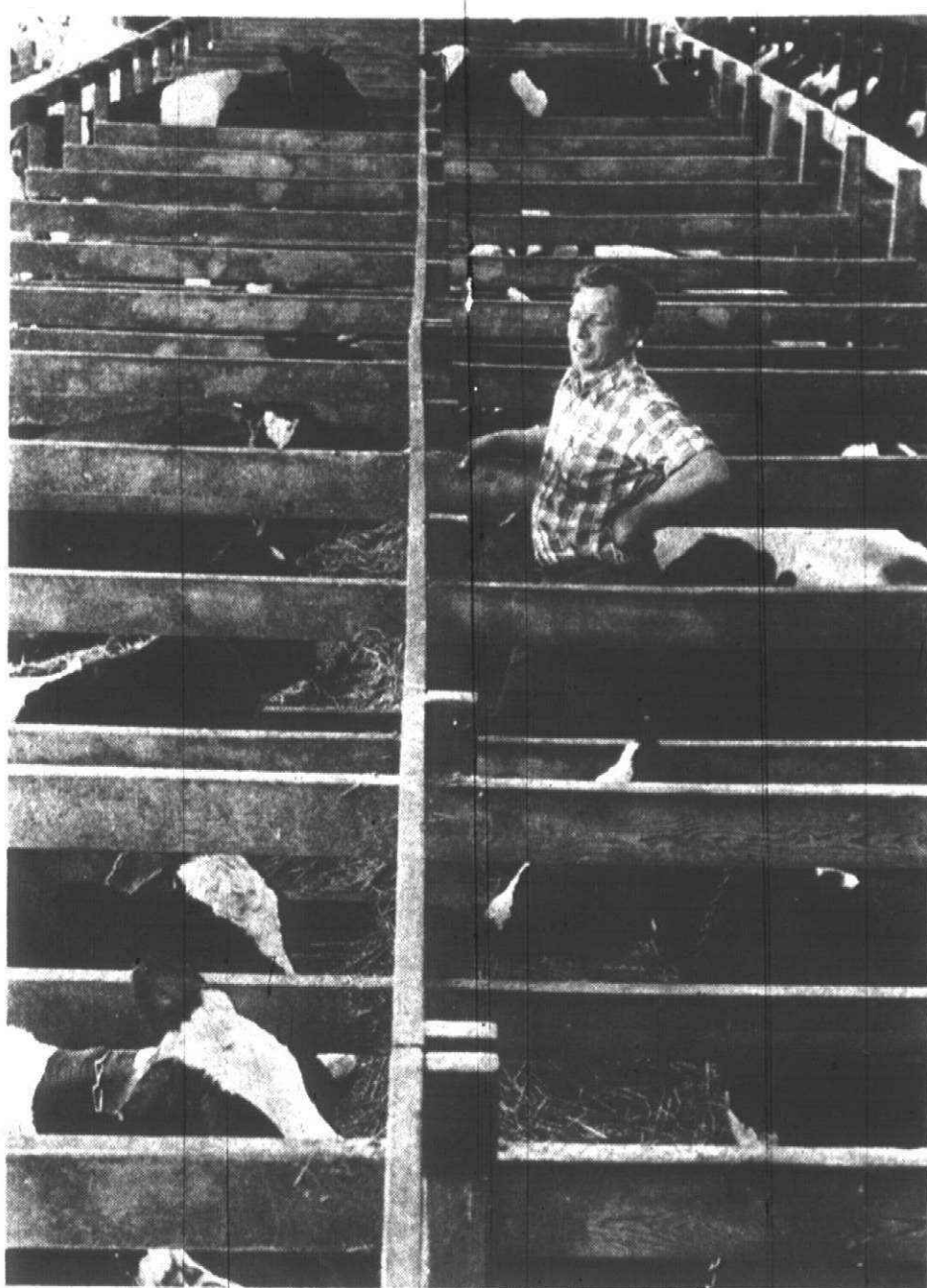
According to Lobbestael, selling prices of some farm crops, such as corn and wheat, have even dropped over the last few years, despite higher or stable prices at the super-market. Prices of farm equipment and supplies have been continually on the rise.

"The middleman's the one who is making all the money," Lobbestael interjected.

"The farmer is the only businessman who has no control over the price of commodities he buys or the price he sells his products for. There seems to be no correlation between costs of production and selling prices at harvest time. You either sell or let your crop rot."

Lobbestael was raised on a farm, and said love of the land pulled him back into full-time farming after his retirement. But the notion of monetary gain had nothing to do with it.

Sodbusters endanger 2d largest industry

Canton and other Michigan communities may be whittling away the foundation of the state's second largest industry when they build subdivisions and condominiums on prime agricultural land.

According to Dr. Emmanuel Van Nierop, environmental advisor for the Michigan Agriculture Department, farming is second only to the state's auto industry in terms of dollar returns.

The strength of the farming industry as well as the stability of the state's economy could be seriously jeopardized, Van Nierop warns, if the best agricultural land in the southern portion of the Lower Peninsula (Canton included) continues to develop at the present alarming rate.

ACCORDING TO VAN NIEROP, Canton is located in Michigan's prime agricultural area. The best farming land in the state is in the southern portion of the Lower Peninsula.

E. in the farming areas near the Detroit metropolitan area, however, is under the most pressure to develop, since already-developed areas continue to expand.

To make matters worse, the best agricultural land in those areas is also the best spot for development, Van Nierop said. Prime farming areas are level, well drained, and relatively free of trees, which delights developers.

Donald Juchartz, director of the Wayne County Agriculture Extension Service, says farmland in Canton and some other communities in the Detroit area will be the next to succumb to the western sprawl unless something is done.

"There is a fantastic number of farms going out of business every year," he said. "It's frightening. Canton is at least 10 years ahead of some other areas because of the development that's already there."

PRESSURE TO DEVELOP Canton's farmland began in the mid-1950s when migration from Detroit spread farther west, according to a report submitted by the township's land use study committee.

Until that time, Canton's farming community was stable and prosperous because of good roads, convenient rail service and the availability of the farmer's market in Detroit and Ypsilanti.

Development of farmland became more rapid in 1962, however, when the Michigan Legislature mandated that tax assessments be based on potential developed use rather than actual farming use.

Tax rates jumped tremendously, and many farmers could no longer afford to pay taxes. When farmers died, their heirs could not afford to pay inheritance taxes on the land.

"The tax situation, the age of many of the landowners and the imminence of development removed the incentives to improve or maintain the land," the land use committee's report states.

Tilling became blocked and useless. Machinery was not repaired, and farm buildings were not improved. When it appeared that development was inevitable, county drains and ditches fell into

disrepair. Some ditches became non-existent, and drains became clogged with trees and brush."

BUT, ACCORDING to the committee, good farmland still remains in Canton.

The committee has identified some 6,000 acres of "prime" agricultural land that should and can be preserved if Canton residents are willing to reduce farmers' tax rates and pay the farmer for his lost development rights.

Under the committee's proposal, township officials would set up a special assessment district in the prime agricultural sections. Residents of the special district would pay a reduced tax rate but would lose some urban services.

Van Nierop views agriculture, the state's second largest industry, as a hedge against depression, should a severe energy shortage cripple the state's other top industries—automobile production and tourism.

He also is worried about the state's food supply. Michigan currently imports about 50 per cent of its food, but that percentage will rise if the state's farmland is developed.

"It's obvious we're losing our best farmland that's needed for food production," Van Nierop said. "We just cannot afford to lose this agricultural land."

"Many people aren't concerned, because they feel the western states will provide us with food. But, for one thing, farmland is disappearing all over the country. For another thing, the western states have experienced drought. When it does rain, it rains in torrents and most of the rain drains off."

Nationally, Van Nierop views agricultural exports to other countries as a means to accomplish a favorable balance of trade.

"The only place where no other nation can compete with the United States is agriculture," he said. "But agricultural land is being trampled on and regarded as a cheap commodity. What we have to do is use poor agricultural land for development and save good agricultural land for agriculture."

Beyer returns

Robert O. Beyer of Plymouth recently returned from the 68th convention of Rotary International held in San Francisco.

Beyer, a member of the Rotary Club of Plymouth, and his wife Mickie, were among more than 15,000 Rotarians and their guests from nearly 100 countries who attended the convention.

George Romney, former Michigan governor

and past U.S. Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, led a discussion of "Society in Trouble—Youth Without Jobs and Hope."

Reports also were given on the Rotary Foundation which made more than 800 educational awards for 1977-78 and other programs worth \$7.5 million.

Future conventions of Rotary International will be held in Tokyo in 1978 and in Rome in 1979.

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Farm preservation is iffy idea

"There's lots and lots of problems that must be dealt with," Stan Gill said of a proposed plan to preserve farmland in the southwestern section of Canton Township.

"For one thing, the subdivision people have to buy it. For another thing, the farmers must agree to go along."

Gill, co-owner of an 1,100-acre dairy farm on Ridge south of Cherry Hill, is a member of the township's land use study committee that recently submitted a report on the feasibility of retaining farmland in Canton.

According to the committee, some 6,000 acres of "prime" agricultural land should be retained if township residents are willing to pay for it. But an unanswered question is "will farmers put their land in escrow in exchange for the payment?"

Township officials would establish a special agricultural district, reduce

farmers' tax rates and purchase the farmers' land development rates as compensation under the committee's proposed plan.

BUT GILL and Alfred (Fritz) Lobbestael, another farmer who manned the land use study committee, are not completely certain of farmers' favorable reaction toward the proposed plan.

Both say it would all depend on the amount offered to farmers as compensation for relinquishing developed rights.

"I haven't made any decision if I'd do it," said Lobbestael, who owns 40 acres on Geddes at the township's western line. "It would just depend on how much they'd offer me for my development rights."

Under the proposed plan, a farmer would sell his development rights to the township for the difference be-

tween his land's agricultural value and the potential value if it were sold for development.

If agricultural land is valued at \$1,000 an acre but the market value for developed use is pegged at \$5,000, the township would pay the farmer \$4,000 an acre for his lost development rights.

The land would be zoned agricultural and placed in a special tax assessment district. The land would then be taxed for its actual farming value rather than for its potential developed use.

Although committee members say farmers' participation in the program should be voluntary, Gill admits that farmers would be forced to sell their development rights if their land was zoned agricultural. Development in an agriculturally-zoned area would not be permitted.

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"It may be called voluntary, but you'd be crazy if you didn't do it," Gill said.

BEFORE THE PLAN can be a reality, however, subdivision residents must help bankroll it. Committee members, Gill says, must convince township residents that it's cheaper to preserve farmland than to provide services to developed areas.

Township board members last Tuesday tabled approval of a \$40,000

"I never even harbored the thought of farming full-time when I was younger," he said, "because I knew I couldn't support my family."

NOT ALL CANTON farmers are operating at the break-even level, however.

Stan and Don Gill operate one of the 10 largest dairy farms in Michigan on their 1,100 acres on Ridge south of Cherry Hill.

Straddling Wayne and Washtenaw counties, the farm bustles with activity as the Gills and six hired hands tend the 400 milking cows and 350 heads of young cattle on day and night shifts. Feed corn, wheat and hay cover the 1,100 acres.

Stan Gill said he and his brother purchased additional acreage a few years ago and hope someday to purchase more.

Gill attributes the affluence on his farm, however, to its size and specialized dairy business. The Gills operate the only dairy farm in Canton Township.

"If we strictly used the land for cash crops, there's no way we could buy additional land and pay for it," the dairy farmer said.

Donald Juchartz, director of the Wayne County Agricultural Extension Service, agrees. The most profitable type of farming, he says, is specialized.

"General farming with a lot of different crops just can't make it any longer," Juchartz said. "If a farmer insists on staying in general farming, he can't do it on small acreage. He has to have a large farm, or he has to specialize."

Lobbestael calls the farmer's economic troubles a "national scandal."

"I look at farming as a business and a way of life," he said. "It's the most important single business in the world, and the American farmer out-produces everyone in the world. But if he loses his interest and economic incentive to farm, what do you have then?"

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River management is name of the game

In an effort to preserve this area's greatest liquid asset, the Rouge River, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources will hold a meeting June 23 to form a watershed council.

Representatives of 41 cities, townships and communities have been invited to the meeting in the Birmingham Ice Arena.

The move toward formation of a watershed council has been supported for many years by the League of Women Voters through its Rouge Basin Committee. Also pushing for a Rouge council were Redford Township and Birmingham.

Representing the City of Plymouth at Thursday's meeting will be Alan Gove, city engineer, and Mark Wollenweber, assistant to the city manager. Plymouth Township's representative will be Trustee Lee Fidge. A spokesman for Canton Township said Canton will not be represented. "Everyone will be in Washington that day attending Congressman Ford's municipal conference."

Redford Township is sending Sue Burt, grants administrator, and Westland is sending DPW director Bill Engle.

IN BACKING THE CONCEPT of an area council, the DNR indicated its agreement with a statement recently voiced at a meeting of the Livonia League of Women Voters.

"The Rouge River is a national resource," said guest speaker Lynne Goldsmith of the Northville-Plymouth-Canton-Nowi league, who is a member of the board of trustees of Canton Township. "Whatever action one community takes directly affects the rest of the river, particularly those downstream."

Once an area watershed council has been established, it is expected that one of its first acts will be to exchange information on what each community is planning that would in any way alter the river and its tributaries. In this way downstream representatives can yell "Whoa!" for example, when upstream communities announce the building of a large drain that might deluge the lower areas with storm flooding.

Water is not the not political issue in these parts that it is in drier areas such as Arizona and California, but it warm enough for a political group like the league to have been warning area residents for years about what has been going on to tarnish the most useful and beautiful jewel this area can boast.

IN THE YEARS to come, water politics probably will come up frequently in council meetings if one area attempts to alter the river basin at the expense of other areas.

Arguments may swirl over encroachments on the flood plain or over the desire to straighten, pave or put underground parts of the Rouge or its tributaries.

Confrontations can come up over big questions such as the six-mile straightening and cementing of the Rouge near Fair Lane in Dearborn by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

The cost in money was \$42 million. The cost in loss of trees, vegetation and a beautiful recreation area was also great.

Political confrontations can also come up over tiny tributaries such as one in Livonia south of Six Mile between Merriman and Middle Belt.

While a small issue, it nonetheless typifies the continual struggle over river management policies, and the plans of developers.

In this case, area residents fear that a new housing development may cause a heavy runoff during storms that will intensify floods in downstream areas.

RIVER MANAGEMENT will be the name of the game when area representatives begin to meet regularly to protect the river. Flood plain control will probably be the bottom of many issues.

Not all those who drive along the Edward Hines Parkway, or use it for picnics and sports are aware that the park is the gift of farsighted people who early on understood that a river should be allowed to flood.

The main reason for allowing flooding is simple and sensible. By being allowed to flood, river water will soak into the flood plain naturally and less water will be carried to flood areas downstream.

The water would then be allowed to replenish the local water table. In the case of the Hines and other flood plain areas, a park can be developed for use by countless numbers of people nearby.

At the league meeting addressed by Mrs. Goldsmith, Livonia's city engineer, Ed Siemert, discussed the way in which Livonia protects its flood plain from encroachment.

"**WE THINK WE** have a very enforceable ordinance protecting the Tarabusi and Bell creeks," he said. These are two tributaries of the Rouge.

"There are battles over it because people want to use the flood plain land on their property as space for a garage or some other project," he added. "But with this ordinance, we can take them to court and prevent it."

Mrs. Goldsmith also extolled the importance of allowing the river and its tributaries to overflow naturally. When a river is not allowed to flood naturally, the racing waters can erode the river banks, she said.

Mrs. Goldsmith dislikes any kind of strait jacket for the Rouge and the streams that drain into it.

"Builders do it in Canton," she said in an interview after her speech. "They often reroute streams. It is done to accommodate more development. You can get more houses in an area by straightening the stream and putting it in a pipe underground instead of building around it."

"It is important for rivers to meander, even little ones. It helps filter the water and slow the flow. Once you disturb a natural stream or river, there is no way to get it back."

RECENTLY THIS CANTON trustee indicated she would favor a moratorium on approval for new building plans in Canton for a reason that touched partly on the Rouge.

Overloading of sewers already operating at capacity was the reason the issue was introduced at a township board meeting. Mrs. Goldsmith believes overloading the sewers might cause both basement back-ups and a discharge of sewage into the Lower Rouge.

Not everyone's favorite topic, sewage is still an important issue in regard to the Rouge, and one to which a watershed committee may have to address itself.

Some of the municipalities in the areas have combined sanitary sewers with storm drains. Others, such as Livonia, separate their systems so that rain runoff will empty into the Rouge and raw sewage into interceptors that carry it to the Detroit Treatment Plant.

Redford Township, Garden City and Dearborn are among the communities that use combined sewers, which carry both storm runoff and sewage to the treatment plant. The problem with combined sewers is that a heavy storm will cause them to send excess sewage and runoff into the Rouge.

Redford Township, with 90 about per cent of its sewage in combined sewers, has recently taken the first planning step to separate its sewers.

Jaycettes search for gong show acts

The local Jaycettes are planning the gong show as a fundraiser. Proceeds will be added to a statewide program undertaken by the Michigan Jaycees. The state organization has made a

dual commitment—to make the public aware of Reye's Syndrome and to raise money to research the disease.

REYE'S SYNDROME is a non-communicable disease which attacks generally healthy children 18 years of age and under. It usually follows a viral illness such as the flu or chicken pox.

It is not rare but rather a little known disease that is devastating and fatal in about half of the cases.

Michigan has the highest reported incidence of Reye's Syndrome in the United States. It is primarily a disease of white suburban children, equally divided between the sexes. Reye's has become the number two killer of children in viral related central nervous system diseases. Encephalitis is first.

A child may be recovering from a viral disease when the symptoms of Reye's Syndrome appear. It is characterized by uncontrollable vomiting, de-

lirium and vomiting.

Other signs include: Dilated pupils, disorientation, convulsions, personality change and extraordinary fast, deep breathing.

Sudden persistent vomiting is almost always the first symptom. Soon after that the child may become totally irrational, screaming, striking out, biting and unable to recognize family members or familiar surroundings.

THESE CONDITIONS warrant immediate medical attention, by the family physician or at a hospital emergency room. Immediate action will provide the best opportunity for the child to survive.

Since the cause is unknown, there is no specific cure. Current supportive therapy includes replacing body fluids, aiding respiration and minimizing convulsions.

If sufficient time can be gained with

supportive treatment, the child has a good chance for recovery.

The Reye's Syndrome Study Center is a joint venture of Children's Hospital of Michigan and Wayne State University School of Medicine.

The center provides: Reye's Syndrome patient referral resources; education for physicians concerning the disease; an information program for physicians throughout the state providing "hot line" consultation services; and research.

Original support for Reye's Syndrome research came from families of victims. The Kenny-Michigan Rehabilitation Foundation has pledged funds and assistance.

The Michigan Jaycees began its financial and awareness support program in September 1976.

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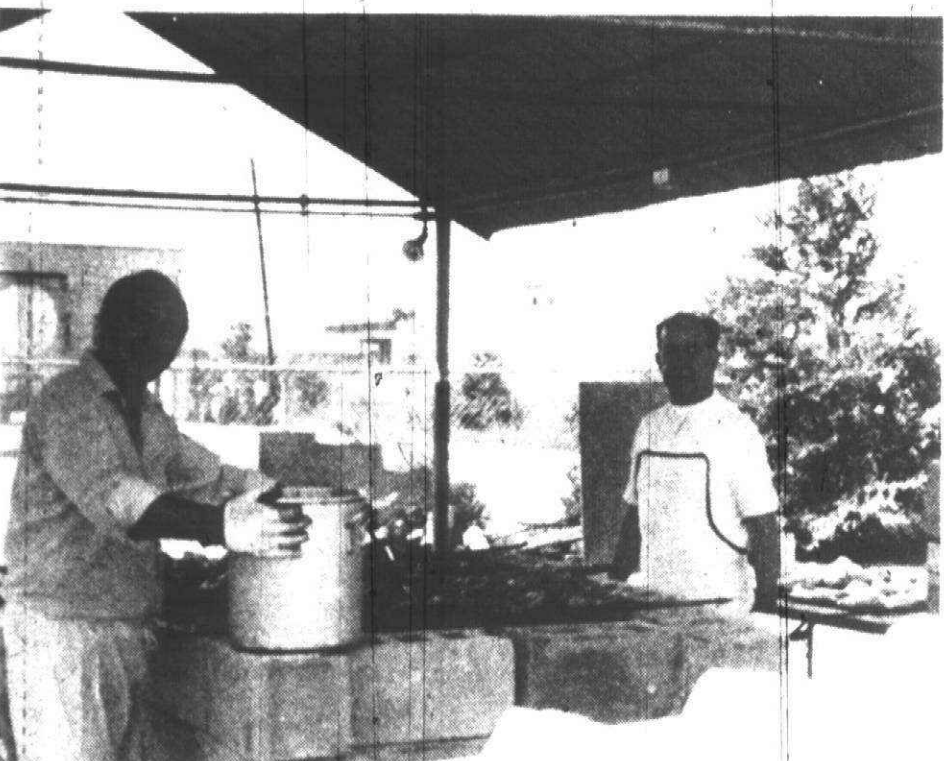

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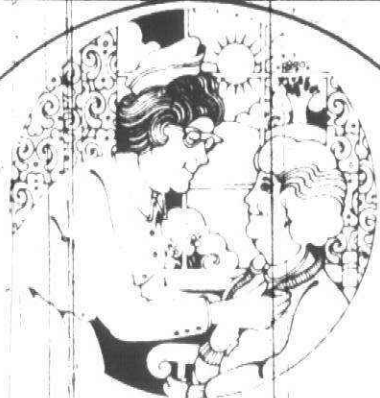
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Ex-Chief bats .321 at EMU

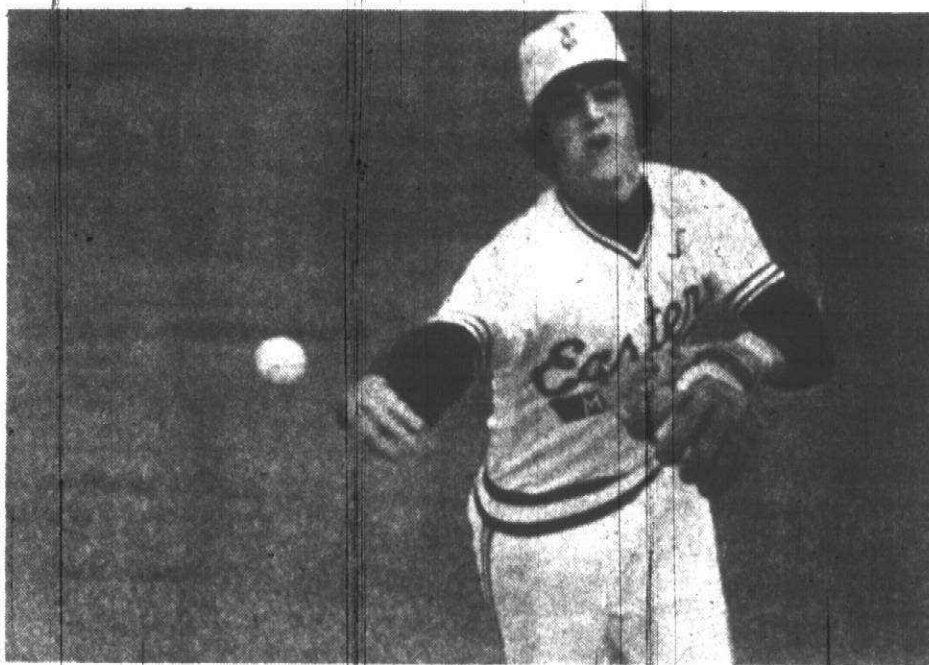
home run. Stemberger also knocked home 20 runs.

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
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Chiefs finish 4th in state

Observer announces boys track squad

The recently-concluded boys' track season was generally an excellent one for area runners and fieldmen, and made for good showings by teams.

Livonia Franklin won the Northwest Suburban League championship, Livonia Churchill, undefeated in dual meets, claimed the Western Six League title for the sixth spring in a row and Redford Union exhibited two state champions.

Garden City West finished second in the Tri-River League, while Livonia Stevenson and Westland John Glenn were runners-up in the Inter-Lakes and Northwest Suburban Leagues, respectively.

Area coaches met after the state finals had been completed to select the 1977 all-Observer Track & Field Teams. Here are the results:

FIRST TEAM

Bob Babits, pole vault, Redford Union. Babits, a senior, virtually led the weekly track listing all season long in his specialty.

In addition to winning the Class A state championship with a best vault of 14 feet 11 inches, Babits bested the field at the prestigious Mansfield, Huron and Spartan relays.

He was Suburban Eight League champion two seasons in a row and this spring was named to the Michigan All-Star team.

Babits has accepted an athletic scholarship to Western Michigan University.

Kevin Chapel, high jump, Livonia Churchill. Chapel, a two-time Western Six League champion, holds both the conference and school high jump records with a best leap of six feet six inches.

Chapel had the best jump this spring at the Belleville Relays, finished second at the regionals and placed eighth early in the season at the Spartan Relays.

Dave Bowen, long jump, Livonia Franklin. A junior and two-year letterman, Bowen bounced back from a leg injury to lead the Patriots to the Northwest Suburban League title.

A versatile performer, Bowen was conference champion in both the long jump, 21 feet four inches, and the 440-yard dash, 50.3 seconds.

Bowen, also a halfback on Franklin's football team, was a member of the Patriots' state-qualifying 440-yard relay team this year.

Mike Petsch, shot put, Redford Union. Petsch, a junior, won the Class A shot put championship this season with a toss of 56 feet nine inches. Incredibly, he qualified for the state finals in four field events—discus, long jump, high jump and shot put.

His best efforts in the various field events this spring were 57 feet 5½ inches in the pole vault; six feet 7¼ inches in the high jump; 149 feet four inches in the discus and 20 feet 3½ inches in the long jump.

Petsch, who totalled 210 points during the season, bested all Suburban Eight League comers in the all-conference meet in the shot.

In an unprecedented move, area coaches unanimously named Petsch Fieldman of the Year to complement the Trackman of the Year.

Mark Dewitt, discus, Livonia Churchill. Dewitt, this year, placed first at the Western Six League Meet, 157 feet one inch, at the Belleville Relays, 153 feet eight inches, and at the Lakeland Regional, 148 feet 11 inches.

Dewitt, also a shot putter, placed second in that event at the conference meet and fourth at the regional.

The senior also earned a spot on the Observer Wrestling Honor Roll last winter.

Mark Niemchak, 120-yard hurdles, Livonia Stevenson. Niemchak, who placed first in both the high and low hurdles at the Inter-Lakes League Meet and anchored the Spartans' title-

winning shuttle hurdle team at the Observerland Relays, recorded a best time of 14.4 seconds in the highs.

Niemchak, a senior, was undefeated in dual competition and placed ninth in the highs at the state finals.

Mark Oblinger, 330-yard Hurdles, Garden City West. The junior was Tri-River League champ in the low hurdles, 38.9 seconds, and second in both the high hurdles, 15.0 seconds, and the 220-yard dash, 23.0 seconds.

Oblinger, a two-year letterwinner, finished third in the lows at the regional and 12th at the state finals. He was the high-point junior on the team.

Mark Boyd, two-mile run, Garden City West. Boyd, a senior, team captain and three-year letterman, owns West records in both the two-mile, 9:29.1, and the mile, 4:22.8. He has also scored more points in one season than any other runner in the history of West track.

Boyd finished first at the conference meet this year in the two mile and placed second in the mile. He was eighth in the state in the mile.

Boyd anchored West's winning distance medley relay team this spring at the Observerland Relays.

Ted Unold, mile run, Westland John Glenn. An outstanding distance runner, Unold this season placed second in the state finals in the mile for the second time in a row.

The senior finished first in both the mile, 4:26.5, and the 880-yard run, 1:56.8, at the Northwest Suburban League Meet.

Unold placed first in the two mile for two years at the Wayne Invitational and the Western Wayne Relays. He won the mile this year at the Huron Relays.

His best-ever distance clockings are 9:21.2 in the two mile, 4:16.4 in the mile and 1:56.6 in the half mile.

Unold, this spring, was unanimously selected by area coaches as Trackman of the Year.

John Simigian, 880-yard run, Livonia Bentley. A senior and two-year letterman, Simigian, this year, placed third in the half mile at the Suburban Eight League Meet.

During many duals, Simigian would run the 440 and the 880 plus anchor the Bulldogs' mile-relay team.

A good student, Simigian also ran cross country for Bentley.

Bill Rowley, 440-yard dash, Livonia Stevenson. Rowley, the Spartans' top point scorer this season, finished first in the 440 at the Inter-Lakes League Meet. His best time of the year in the event was 50.1 seconds.

Rowley, a senior, placed ninth in the state finals (440) and anchored Stevenson's winning sprint medley and mile relay teams at the Observerland Relays.

Ron Cwik, 220-yard dash, Redford Bishop Borgess. The Spartans' co-captain, Cwik, a senior, was undefeated at 220 yards in dual meets this season.

He finished third at the Catholic League Meet and was named to the first all-Central Division squad. His best 220 effort of the year was 22.4 seconds.

Cwik holds or shares six varsity records.

Steve Krogulecki, 100-yard dash, Redford Bishop Borgess. The junior advanced to the semifinals of the 100 at the state finals, placed second at the regionals, third at the Catholic League Meet and fourth at the Ashley Relays.

Undefeated in Central Division competition, Krogulecki is a co-sharer of the Borgess record in the 100 with a time of 10.0 seconds.

Ron Cwik, Tim Turner, Mike Zelmanski and Steve Krogulecki, 440-yard relay, Redford Bishop Borgess.

This spring, the foursome placed first at the Knights of Columbus-Bish-

op Foley Relays, the Elks Relays, the Catholic League Meet and the regionals.

The quartet, which turned in a time of 44.0 seconds for its best race of the year, also finished second at the Observerland Relays.

Chuck Beane, Mike Wheeler, Terry Winter and Bill Rowley, 880-yard relay and mile relay, Livonia Stevenson.

The foursome finished first in the mile relay at the West Bloomfield Invitational and at the Observerland Relays and placed first in the 880-yard relay at West Bloomfield.

The quartet placed second at the Inter-Lakes League Meet and second at the regionals and eighth in the state finals in the mile.

In the state meet, Beane ran a split of 51.9 seconds in the mile relay, Wheeler, 51.5 seconds, Winter, 51.5 seconds, and Rowley, 50.1 seconds.

All except Rowley are underclassmen.

The Stroller Recalling editors

Every now and then, especially on rainy days, The Stroller likes to lean back in his easy chair, close his eyes and retrace some of his steps along the journalistic trail and meet again some of the editors for whom he has toiled.

Over the years, he has worked under many a colorful character and some with the most unusual traits and ideas on newspaper composition. And all of them have left some pleasant memories.

And it never fails at any of these nostalgic sessions that the sight of old Charlie Weiser, his first editor, comes into view.

He was the last of the brown derby wearers and some of his ideas and actions have lived through the years, and never will be forgotten. He gave The Stroller some of the best advice he ever received from any editor.

One of the fondest memories of Weiser concerns the first promotional program our hometown paper ever attempted. The head of the promotional department came up with the idea of running a baby contest with grand prizes for the parents of the winner.

Everything went fine until Old Charlie saw it. He took one look at the poster and proceeded to tear it up, along with the ad that had been prepared for the paper.

"WE'LL HAVE NO baby contest

around here," he said, "because we will make more enemies than friends."

Everyone looked aghast as most members of the staff had approved of the idea.

"We won't even be making a friend of the mother of the winner," he went on, "because she thinks the judges had no other choice."

"And the mothers of the other babies will be mad because their youngster wasn't picked. So, there's nothing to gain and there will be no baby contest!" There wasn't either.

At his typewriter, Old Charlie was just as firm. The Stroller well recalls the day Old Charlie wrote a very critical piece about the city council. And the headline on our front page read: "Half of the City Council Is Crazy."

You can imagine the storm that followed. The city officials jammed the office in complaint. Old Charlie listened. Then, for the first time, we thought he was weakening when he pacified the group by telling them that he would review his notes and that if an apology was necessary, he would gladly make it.

The members of our staff were stunned. We wondered if the wise old editor would back down.

He didn't. The next day, there was another piece on our front page dealing with the city council. And the headline read: "Half of the City Council Isn't Crazy."

YEARS LATER, when he arrived in Detroit, The Stroller met up with another fabulous character. He was Harry Bullion, sports editor of the De-

troit Free Press.

Before he arrived in the city, The Stroller had been told that Bullion was a "hot-headed" Frenchman and that he should not be surprised at anything that happened.

The Stroller didn't have to wait long to find out.

The sports department was on the ninth floor of what is now the Transportation Building in downtown Detroit. And the sports editor's desk was at the window.

Three times during that first week, The Stroller turned from his desk and ducked—for a good reason. Each time, and it happened on three different nights, Bullion got the wrong number on the telephone. He didn't complain to the operator. He just threw the telephone out of the window with a stream of oaths.

Hot-headed? He couldn't be beaten. Then, there was the famous Malcolm Bingay, who graced the sports pages in the Tigers' pennant winning days as "Uffy, The Dopester."

A rock-ribbed Republican, he was on duty on a Sunday afternoon when President Franklin D. Roosevelt was speaking at the Naval Armory, and at the same time the Detroit Zoo was opening with Joe Mendi, the famous baboon, as the main attraction.

That evening, when the first edition of the Free Press hit the streets, it carried this glaring headline on the front page: "30,000 see Joe Mendi—12,000 hear FDR."

No other editor ever would have been so partisan. But there was only one Bingay.

You try to figure this one out. Something has to get done soon before someone gets hurt.

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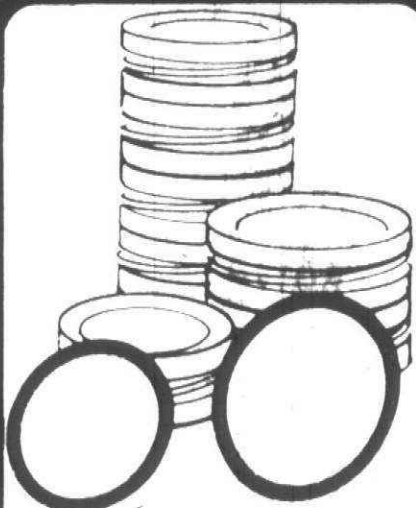
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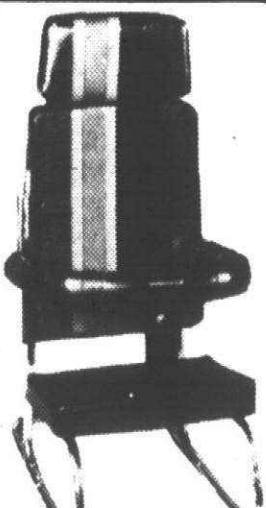


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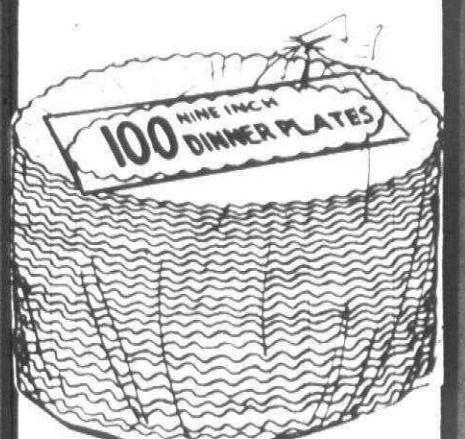


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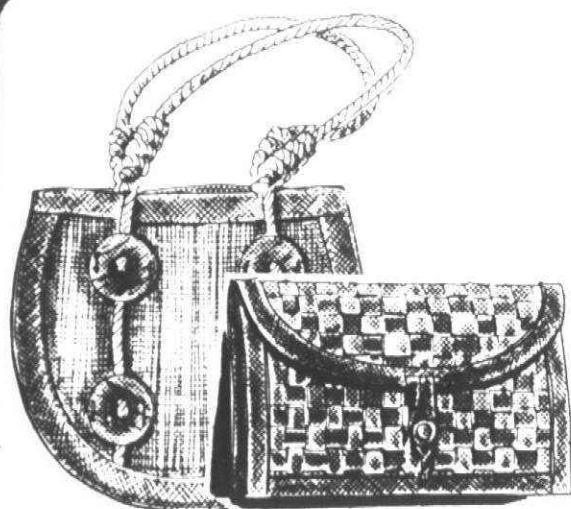


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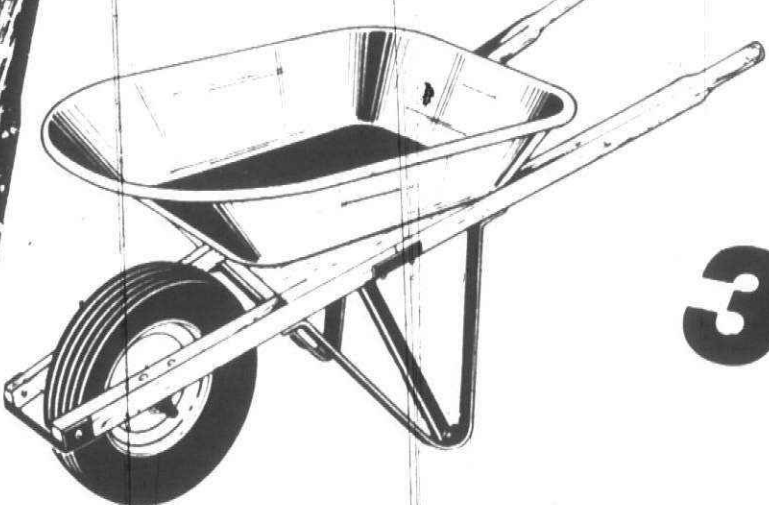
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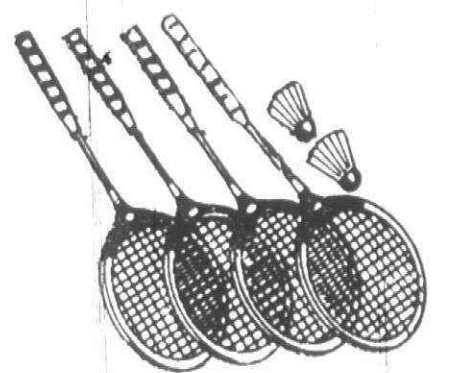
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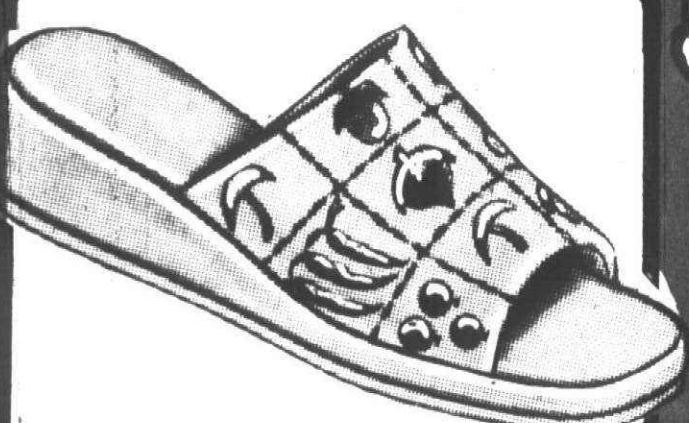


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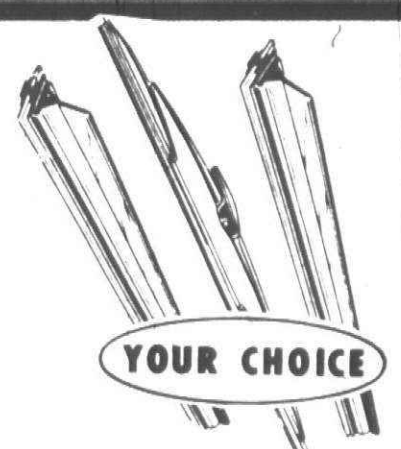

After two years of trying, my backyard has finally sprouted a decent crop of grass.

When we moved almost three years ago, the backyard was nothing but turned-over hard clay—very hard. I rototilled, tilled, tilled and tilled—raked, raked and raked—before sowing some grass seed.

The front yard was sodded but we decided to go with seed in the back where the kids would be playing and so it wouldn't be necessary to lay down the better blue grass.

The first time I seeded, about one-third of the seeds sprouted and weeds overtook the remaining two-thirds of the lawn. When the next spring rolled around, I raked up the bare spots and laid down some more seed. A bit more took but the lawn still was half weeds and half grass.

THEN I HEARD someone claim that the best time to sow grass seed is in late March when the snow still is on the ground.

The seeds will drop through the snow on the first warm day and will sink into the mud right below the snow's surface. The theory is that the seed will begin sprouting early in April when the grounds still muddy and nobody walks on it much.

It sounded like a crazy idea to me, but then my spring sowing hadn't amounted to much so why not try? Besides, I still had some leftover seed stored in the basement. So I decided to give the idea a try.

Shortly after St. Patrick's Day, I walked through my backyard with my bucket of seed sowing at will. I ignored my neighbors looking out the windows, and paid even less attention to the one who asked if I were feeding the birds.

WHEN APRIL arrived, I was quite anxious to see if there'd be any new grass. So I kept a close eye each passing day.

What happened, though, is the weeds began growing first and I really couldn't tell if a new crop of grass had started. I thought there were some new blades among the crabgrass, dandelions and nut grass, but I couldn't really tell.

Lutheran high may open here

There may be a new Lutheran high school opening within the Plymouth-Canton area within five years.

The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod reportedly is ready to purchase a 25-acre site for a high school on Prospect Road south of Ann Arbor Road.

Current planning indicated Huron Valley Lutheran High would open its doors to about 275 student in the fall of 1982.

The school, once opened, would offer a standard high school program with stress on religion, English, history and physical education.

Tuition is expected to run from \$600 to \$1,100 a year, depending upon family income. Members of the Wisconsin Synod will get lower tuition.

Plans are for the high school to serve all of southeastern Michigan.

Huron Valley now holds classes at St. Mary Catholic School in the City of Wayne which closed its high school classes in 1971.

So what happened is that this year we decided to use a commercial firm to spray our lawn with nitrogen and a weed-killer twice in the spring and twice in the fall. At least if the weeds were killed I could try sowing seed again.

A couple days after the second spraying, it became obvious I had a full lawn of grass in back. With the weeds gone, the grass quickly filled in and I received confirmation that the seed planted in March had taken quite well.

In fact, the seed portion of the backyard looks almost as good as the Merion Blue sod. There's a place close to the back of the house where the sod and seeded areas meet, and you almost can't tell them apart except for a slight difference in grade.

So if you have trouble seeding a lawn, try sowing the seed atop the snow during the last two weeks of March. Ignore your neighbors and all the jesting.

And if a nice crop of grass doesn't come up in April, forget where you read this nonsense.

There's no question that tuition for Schoolcraft College district residents will go up \$2 a credit hour in the fall.

The only question is whether the board of trustees will raise tuition for non-resident students, too. The fear is that Schoolcraft's non-resident tuition, already among the highest for Michigan community colleges, will become non-competitive.

A related fear, expressed by Trustee Mark McQuesten, is that a non-resident tuition which is too high will harm the diversity—hence the quality—of the community college's student body.

An answer is likely at the June 22 board meeting, when the seven trustees must make some hard policy decisions as they prepare the 1977-78 budget. The options were explored at a June 15 study session. Budget making is complicated by the recent defeat of a property tax ballot proposal.

HISTORICALLY, Schoolcraft has

followed a 1-2-3 tuition policy. Thus, current rates are \$13 a credit hour for district residents, \$26 for out-of-district Michigan residents and \$39 for out-of-state residents.

A study by Vice-President Edward McNally showed that, compared to Schoolcraft:

- Six Michigan community colleges have the same tuition rate for residents, seven are lower and 15 higher. Thus, Schoolcraft ranks a little below the middle for what it charges local residents.
- 23 other colleges have lower non-resident tuition and five are higher.
- 27 districts have lower out-of-state tuition rates and only one is higher.

A TUITION hike of 2-2-1, resulting in rates of \$15, \$28 and \$40 respectively, would place Schoolcraft in these positions:

- For district residents, 21 other districts would be lower, four the same, and only three higher.

- For non-residents, one would be the same, 25 lower and two higher.

- For out-of-state residents, 27 would be lower and only one higher.

College administrators figure a 2-2-1 schedule of tuition increases will yield \$293,000 total revenue next fiscal year. They will work out revenue projections for 2-0-0 and 2-1-1 increases for the June 22 meeting.

AN INCREASE in tuition was a foregone conclusion in the wake of the June 13 voter defeat of a 0.8-mill property tax increase.

Trustee Arch Vallier, retiring at the end of June, cautioned that it would look bad politically to raise only resident tuition and not non-resident.

But board Chairman Paul Kadish said further increases for non-residents "will drive away students who are already paying top dollar."

And Trustee Ron Cowden said he had "all kinds of qualms" about rais-

ing non-resident tuition.

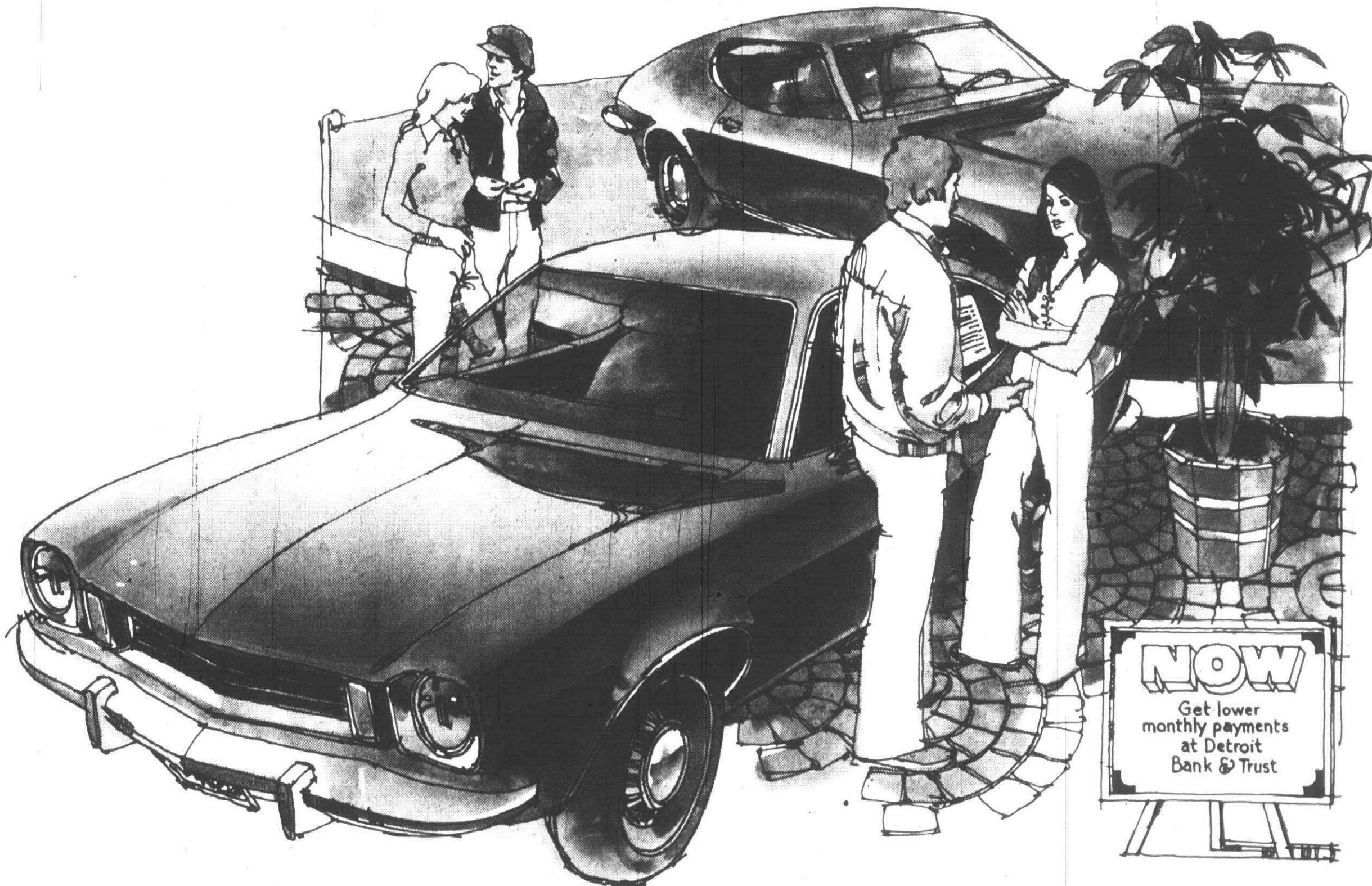
THE 1977-78 BUDGET is shaping up as a \$10.6 million package with no new programs and only one new job—a director of labor relations, according to President C. Nelson Grote.

"This is a continuation budget with a couple of minor additions," said E.F. Petersen, manager of business services.

The millage defeat cut the package by some \$350,000. Of that, \$175,000 was to go to special maintenance and equipment funds. Some of the loss will be made up by the tuition increase, which could yield as much as \$293,000, depending on what formula the board adopts.

A public hearing on the new budget is scheduled for 8 p.m. Wednesday, June 29, in the board's conference room of the administration building on the main campus at 18600 Hagerty, Livonia.

Watch kids closer in summer

What should we do with the kids this summer?

That is the question many suburban parents are currently asking themselves in view of the abduction-murders of four children in the past 16 months.

While children like to roam free during vacation, parents must weigh the dangers of allowing them free rein, especially this summer, with the Oakland County culprit or culprits still at large.

Members of the Oakland County Homicide Task Force investigating the murders say that school is like a built-in babysitter. When school is in session, parents at least know where their children are most of the day.

With the start of summer vacation, however, that is no longer the case. For parents, that presents a problem.

But task force members say there are reasonable precautions parents can take to insure their children's safety while still allowing them freedom to enjoy their days away from school.

"Parents should try and keep closer supervision of their children and make sure if they're going anywhere that they go in groups of three or four," advises state police Sgt. Joseph Krease.

"Looking back at our four victims, in each and every case the child was isolated—maybe a block from someone else. When this happens they are vulnerable to this individual or individuals."

Water board curbs voted in house

With strong suburban support, the Michigan House of Representatives has passed and sent to the senate a pair of bills designed to curb the powers of the board that governs the Detroit water and sewer department.

The bills, written by Rep. John Bennett (D-Redford) and co-sponsored by Rep. Sal Rocca (D-Sterling Heights), are aimed at giving suburban customers of the Detroit system a voice in operating the department, requiring public hearings prior to rate increases and mandating an annual, independent audit.

All Observer & Eccentric area representatives supported both bills with two exceptions. Rep. James Defebaugh (R-Birmingham) opposed the bill reorganizing the water board, and Rep. Mel Larsen (R-Oxford) was absent with leave.

THE BILLS were opposed by many Detroit legislators as well as an assortment of conservative Republicans from small cities outstate.

HB 4018, approved 70-27 on June 8, would expand the Detroit water board from seven members to nine, with five appointed by the mayor of Detroit and four selected by suburban communities who buy Detroit water and sewer services.

Presently, all seven members are appointed by the mayor and may be removed by him.

"The four non-Detroit members would be elected by an assembly of local units of government served by the system," said Bennett. "Each community would have one assembly vote for each 10,000 population, with every community entitled to at least one vote."

"Suburban people pay an enormous share of the costs of the department, and the department has benefitted from both state and federal funds."

"Tell them not to stop to talk to anyone for any reason and to report any encounters," Sgt. Krease adds.

BIRMINGHAM youth officer Doug Marble says families in which both parents are employed should make arrangements during the summer for their children to be looked after by a neighbor, relative or babysitter.

"Make sure there's someone there for them to report to. If possible, the mother or father should come home for lunch," he says.

Children should not be allowed to hitchhike or to go out after dark, police caution.

Another good policy, according to Southfield Township youth officer Dr. Jerry Tobias, is to have children check in or call home every couple of hours. When children know their parents are keeping track of them they tend to exercise more caution.

When going to a friend's house to play, the child should call when he arrives and when he's ready to leave, Tobias adds.

Police say it is unreasonable to expect children to stay away from playgrounds and shopping centers. The chances of abduction are dramatically reduced, however, if the child is accompanied by several playmates.

"Even two kids don't have as much protection as three or four," says Sgt. Krease. He (the suspect) wouldn't encounter a group that large."

"I would advise parents not to send youngsters to the store at vulnerable

times of day. They should continue to advise them to be aware of people they don't know. Especially older folks who are over-patronizing," Tobias adds.

"The lines of communication between the parent and child have to be opened," says task force head Lt. Robert Robertson.

"The children should be told not to go with anybody who's not a member of the family. The person may seem innocent and friendly."

"MY OWN personal feeling is that I wouldn't let my 10- or 11-year-old out after dark under any circumstances, even if we didn't have this situation."

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New CB slogan could save a kid

Youngsters need to be reminded—constantly—that there's a child abductor and killer still lurking in the suburbs.

One way to keep the message alive is for Citizens Band radio operators to sign off with a message that will warn youngsters to be careful about whom they associate with.

A concerned group is sponsoring a contest, open to everyone of any age, for a new CB slogan relaying that message.

At present, CB operators say goodbye with the signal "10-4." Others use "Mobile easy." "All those good numbers to you" or "I'll catch you on the flip" to bid farewell.

Several CB clubs have agreed to provide judges for the CB slogan contest. Those clubs will then adopt the sign-off slogan.

The two club monitor Channel 9, the standard CB emergency line, for messages regarding the safety of children.

To enter, use a post card or piece of paper to jot down your suggested slogan. Then print your name, address and ZIP code, and telephone number below it. Mail your entry to:

"CB Slogan," 1225 Bowers, Birmingham, MI. 48012.

Deadline is July 1.

Only one slogan will be adopted, but there will be several prizes. First prize winner will receive a 40-channel Citizens Band radio. Second and third prizes will be gift certificates for CB equipment.

THE CONTEST is just one of many ways children and adults can keep constantly aware of the danger.

In the last year one or more killers have claimed the lives of Tim King, 11, Christine Mihelich, 10, Mark Stebbins, 12, and Jill Robinson, 12.

The CB slogan contest was suggested by a public relations advisory committee—made up of volunteer area publicists—which has encouraged other such child safety programs.

They gave McDonald's Restaurants the idea of printing placemats with a warning message. The placemats will be distributed to that chain in the tri-county area during July.

Ex-Cell-O will print milk cartons with warning messages. You will see

them in southeast Michigan late in summer.

Others projects either implemented in the past or possibilities for the near future, include flyers stuffed in grocery bags or mailed to residences and a national Child Safety Week.

The advisory committee works closely with the Oakland Homicide Task Force, made up of police in two counties and headed by Birmingham Chief Rollin G. Tobin.

Idea for the committee came from Southfield City Administrator Peter Cristiano, who asked for volunteers because the task force had no funds for anything but investigators.

The publicists found virtually everyone they approached was willing to help.

The work of reminding children must go on all over the metropolitan area. The killer has demonstrated he has no qualms crossing city, township or county lines. Although most of the previous abductions have occurred in the Woodward Avenue corridor, there's no guarantee that that is his only prowling place.

Exhaust all possibilities

Are you embarrassed when you drive down the street because your car sounds so awful? One thing is for sure, when you need a new muffler, your car certainly tells you—loud and clear.

But, other parts of the exhaust system can develop holes without giving any warning sound. And these holes are dangerous because they can let deadly carbon monoxide into your car without your being aware of it.

To help you make sure your car's exhaust system is healthy, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has a new publication. For your free copy of Vehicle Exhaust Systems, send a postcard to the Consumer Information Center, Dept. 631E, Pueblo, Colo. 81009.

There are four main parts in all car exhaust systems: the manifold where the exhaust leaves the engine, the exhaust pipe, the muffler, and the tail pipe. On most newer cars (1975 and on) there is also a catalytic converter.

BE SURE to inspect the exhaust system regularly. At least twice a year have your car put on a lift for a thorough inspection of the underside (a good time to do this is when you're having a lubrication or oil change, or during a tuneup).

Make sure all the clamps holding the parts together are tight and hangers attaching the system

to the car are not broken. Look for holes and signs of weakness. Check for discolored spots at various joints. Examine the manifold for cracks and breaks.

If you're not comfortable doing this yourself, ask your service station person to do it.

LEARN TO watch for symptoms of exhaust system trouble, like: noisy exhaust caused by a hole in the muffler, hissing noise in the exhaust caused by a bent or clogged tailpipe, a hissing or popping sound in the engine compartment caused by a crack in the manifold, fumes under the car or in the engine compartment caused by holes or breaks in the system, or leaks at the various points where the system sections are connected.

Drive with a window open when you have evidence of an exhaust system problem. In fact, it's a good idea to keep a window at least a little bit open all the time, in case you have an exhaust problem that hasn't been detected.

Inspect your exhaust system as soon as possible after going over a bump or scraping your muffler or tailpipe to make sure there's been no damage.

Don't put off having an exhaust problem corrected and DO NOT work on your car in a confined space with the motor running.

WHEN WORKING in the garden this summer, make sure you know what kind of pesticide you are working with. Children 2 to 5 are the most common victims of the more than 5 million accidental poisonings that occur each year in the United States. Keep children and pets away from the areas where you mix and apply the pesticide. Following the application, keep people away from the area and see that they avoid contact with sprayed surfaces.

BEFORE SPRAYING garden crops, double check the label for restrictions on spraying the plants that will be eaten in future weeks. Depending on the type of pesticides used and when applied, most leafy vegetables and fruits such as tomatoes must not be sprayed during a certain period of time before harvest. And, of course, all vegetables should be washed before eating.

MAKE SURE that you keep all poison products in their original containers. Never in pop bottles, fruit jars, or unmarked containers where they might be mistaken for food or drinks.

KEEP PESTICIDES together in a special cabinet under lock and key. Dispose of empty containers immediately. Wash them out if possible. If you burn them, don't subject yourself or a neighbor to the smoke or fumes. Gases released by the heat may be poisonous. Never throw boxes, bottles or cans containing leftover amounts in trash cans accessible to children.

THE FOLLOWING is a list of some of the common poisons you will find on the label of the pesticides you purchase. The compounds are listed according to their toxicity, their ability to poison you if misused.

SUPER TOXIC: HEPT, TEPP, Phosdrin, Parathion, and White Arsenic.

EXTREMELY TOXIC: Demeton (systox), Aldrin, Dieldrin, Paris Green, Lead Arsenate, Endrin, Thallium, Mercury (organic compounds).

VERY TOXIC: Lethane
Toxaphene, Rotenone,
Malathion, DDT, TDE, DDD
Chlordane, Lindane, Benzene
Hexachloride (BHC), 2,4 - D,
Xylene, Heptachlor, Warfarin.

MODERATELY TOXIC:
Thanite, Metoxychlor, Allethrin,
Kerosene, Pyrethrin

SLIGHTLY TOXIC: Captan, Cryolite, Phaltan, Piperonyl Butoxide, Pyrenone
