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## Crane fatality spurs crackdown

Last Friday's fatal crane accident—the second construction-related tragedy to strike a Livonia family in six years—could have been prevented if state safety standards had been fully followed by the construction crew, says an investigator from the Michigan Department of Labor.

Michigan Department of Labor investigators say it appears that state construction safety standards concerning crane and derrick operations were not fully complied with by the Acitelli and Peterman work crew when 23-year-old Chuck Kennedy was crushed between the crane's rotating counterweight and frame Friday in Canton's Sunflower subdivision.

Alex Corwin, Detroit area supervisor for the department of labor's construction safety division, quotes section 1926.550 of the state construction safety standards text:

"Accessible areas within the swing radius of the rear of the rotating super structure of the crane, shall be barricaded in such a manner as to prevent an employee from being struck or crushed by the crane."

Rich Julin, assistant chief of construction safety for the department of labor, says, "At this time—and remember these are only allegations, they have not been cited for any violation—it would appear that some violations of code were committed."

"Number one, it appears that they were not guarding the area around the crane. Under state code, it is supposed to be barricaded off so no one can get near."

Peter Acitelli, co-owner of Acitelli and Peterman Poured Wall Co. of Farmington, said the company was informed of the barricade regulation last Friday, following the fatal accident, and will follow it from now on.

"Before this happened, no one, and I mean no one, put barricades around cranes, and there's 100 cranes operating around the city," Acitelli says. "Who would think anyone would walk up to a crane when the engine's running?"

"That's like walking into a steam shovel. But as of Monday we are roping off the area. If a crane moves 10 times around the hole, we'll have to stake the area around the crane every time."

Kenneth Kennedy, father of the dead worker, also works for Acitelli and Peterman—ironically as a crane worker. He says he has never heard of the regulation requiring a barricade around the swing radius of a crane counterweight's path.

THE REASON MANY crane operators and construction companies are not aware of the barricade requirement, says a state investigator, is that it only became law in Michigan Jan. 1, 1976 due to federally-mandated regulations.

Julin also admitted that the transient nature of home construction contractors makes it tough for state inspectors to check out the many job sites.

"A company involved in house work will not see us that often," Julin said. "They're here one day pouring a basement and they're in another city the next day. We don't get there that often to observe every individual job site. We've got eight people covering the southeast corner of Michigan. I'm not trying to make excuses, it's just a matter of fact."

Whenever there is a fatality at a

construction site, the Michigan Department of Labor construction safety division must conduct a field investigation. Don Phillips of the construction safety division visited the Canton job site Saturday and Monday but has not yet submitted his findings.

State investigators did not rule out the possibility of writing up violations against the company.

KENNETH KENNEDY says he is convinced his son's death was the result of "a stupid accident," and any further investigation is being done without his encouragement.

"The only time I've ever used a barricade around a crane is when we're working near an open trench," says Kennedy. "I've never heard of that MIOHSA rule and I've been with the company for eight years."

MIOHSA stands for Michigan Occupational Hazards and Safety Act.

"It was just a stupid accident," Kennedy says. "You've got to watch what you're doing when you're working around machinery. We still don't know how it happened but accidents do happen."

"I know a fellow who got his leg

pinched this summer at a job I was working at," Kennedy says. "I thought he was off the machine but he was riding on the back of it."

Kennedy explained that a builder approached him Friday to inform him, for the second time, that a son of his had been killed in a crane accident.

In 1971, Kennedy's oldest son, Doug, died at age 19 when lightning struck a crane that he was standing next to. The elder Kennedy was working at the job site with his son in 1971 when the first tragedy occurred.

Friday, Kennedy was working on a crane in an eastern suburb when he learned that his son, Chuck, was fatally pinned up against the frame of a crane by the machine's rotating counterweight.

Kennedy says he doesn't think the construction field is "any more dangerous than that of steelriggers, factory workers or carpenters."

Still, Kennedy and his wife, Ellen, winced when a younger son spoke up Tuesday saying he wanted to be a construction worker like his father.

"If you do, you'll work inside the crane, not outside like Doug or Chuck," said Mrs. Kennedy.

## Push policy to protect homeowner

Buying a new home in Canton Township can be a frightening experience, especially when liens have been served against property, two builders border on bankruptcy, and the quality of some construction work is questionable.

These are some of the problems new Canton homeowners are facing that township officials claim they are working to correct.

Supervisor Harold Stein said he has instructed township attorneys to investigate the legality of requiring builders to post construction bonds or warranty policies for the protection of homeowners.

Peter Bundarin, Canton attorney, brought the homeowner issue before the township board at its meeting last week. Bundarin asked the board to adopt an ordinance forcing all builders in Canton to offer the Home Owners Warranty (HOW) plan.

The HOW plan protects the homeowner for a full year against defects in workmanship and materials, for two years against major structural difficulties and up to 10 years for major construction defects.

The one-year plan includes appli-

## State legislators hear farm woes at tax bill forum

Farmers from Wayne, Washtenaw and Livingston counties Monday convinced state legislators to reduce acreage eligibility requirements in a bill that would lower taxes on agricultural land.

At a public hearing on House Bill 4580 in the Canton firehall, farmers told members of the House Towns and Counties Committee that farmers who cultivate five acres should be eligible for the tax break if they place their development rights in escrow.

The bill, sponsored by State Rep. Tom Brown (D-Westland), had originally placed an eligibility requirement of 20 tillable acres on farmers who may participate in the program.

But Bart Berg, chairman of Canton's land use study committee, said the 20-acre requirement would shut out many small farmers from the program's benefits.

BROWN'S BILL proposes a tax cut for farmers who live within 25 miles of an urban area with 50,000 or more residents.

To enter the program, a farmer would have to meet acreage eligibility requirements and agree to place his development rights in escrow for a 10-year period.

In return, a five-member council composed of local residents would set the farmer's tax rate at \$10 to \$25 an acre. Currently, taxes on western Wayne County farmland range from \$40 to \$100 an acre.

Although farmers at Monday's hearing appeared in favor of a tax break, some appeared reluctant to give up their development rights. Most of the approximate 40 persons who attended the hearing were farmers from Canton and Plymouth townships, Ypsilanti and South Lyon.

One Canton resident criticized a section of the proposed bill that requires local municipalities to pick up 20 percent of the difference between the assessed valuation of farmland and the reduced taxes a farmer would pay. Under Brown's proposed bill, the state would pick up the remaining 80 percent of the difference.

"I'm 100 per cent for saving farmland," one resident said, "but I'm con-

cerned about the taxes local government would have to take up. It just seems other people would have to pay more taxes, and millage rates would go up."

BROWN BELIEVES his bill is an improvement over Public Act 116, an existing law that provides an income tax credit to farmers who give up their development rights, because it provides for local control.

"Many say there's been hardly any participation in Public Act 116," Brown said, "so why should we introduce another bill?"

"Actually, quite a lot of farmers have participated, but they're mostly big farmers from predominately rural areas."

Brown believes his bill would encourage smaller farmers to participate in a tax-relief program.

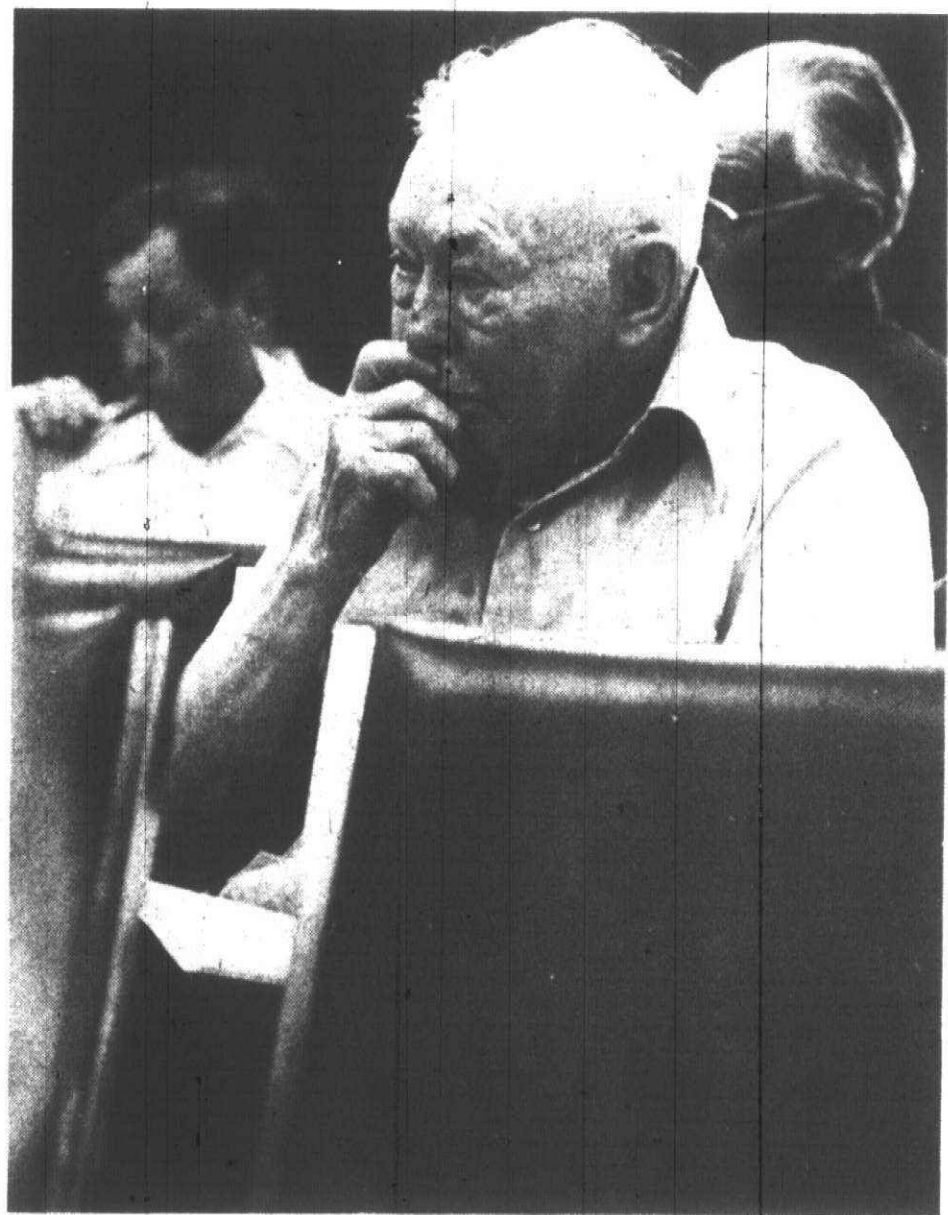
According to Canton Supervisor Harold Stein, no Canton farmers are currently participating in the program outlined by Public Act 116. Helen Richardson, clerk of Plymouth Township, said one farmer in her municipality participates in the existing tax relief program.

CANTON FARMER Duane Bordine appeared in favor of tax breaks for farmers, but criticized a clause in both Public Act 116 and HB 4580 that would penalize farmers for back taxes if they broke the development rights agreement. A farmer could be forced to sell his land for development, Bordine said, because of financial difficulties.

"You come in here screaming about taxes, but you're afraid the government is going to take away your property rights," objected State Rep. Claude A. Trim (D-Davisburg), a member of the House Towns and Counties Committee. "What do you want us to do?"

Brown's bill, Trim noted, does not outline specific penalties for developing on farms receiving tax relief like Public Act 116 does. Under the proposed bill, a local council would review the individual cases of farmers

## Canonization comes to Canton

While thousands of Catholics from around the globe gathered in Rome last Sunday, children marched up to a makeshift altar at Miller Elementary School with bundles of clothing and an American flag to symbolize the life of America's first male saint.

The celebration at Canton's Blessed John Neumann Church in honor of Neumann's rise to sainthood may not have been as grandiose as the canonization ceremony in Rome.

But to Fr. Edward Baldwin, pastor of the three-year-old church, and his hundreds of parishioners, the small celebration had a very special meaning.

"EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY, our name is St. John Neumann," Fr. Baldwin said of the church once jokingly called "St. Miller's" because Mass is temporarily being celebrated in Miller School. "The name John Neumann kind of fits."

According to Baldwin, parishioner Joan Kijek last year suggested Neumann's name for the parish because of Neumann's work among immigrants and the poor.

Mrs. Kijek, Baldwin explained, compared Neumann's emigration from Bohemia to the United States with the migration of persons to Canton Township. Neumann worked closely with German-speaking immigrants, Mrs. Kijek reasoned, and the church at Miller works closely with newly-arrived Cantonites.

Mrs. Kijek's suggestion was thrown into a hat with 50 other names submitted by parishioners, Baldwin said. The church's steering committee screened the list and sent a few of the names to John Cardinal Dearden for his final selection.

"Mrs. Kijek's idea made a lot of

## Jaycees present grant to 'involved' McKenna

## County to accept Stein recall petitions Friday

Both recall camps hope to file their petitions to the Wayne County Clerk tomorrow in their efforts to oust three members from the Canton Township Board of Trustees.

June 24 marks the end of the 90-day deadline for submitting recall petitions against Canton Supervisor Harold Stein to the county. Peter Gabbert, leader of the Stein recall effort, has already scheduled a 10 a.m. appointment with Wayne County Deputy Clerk Orville Tungate, who will receive and check Gabbert's 1,280 locally-inspected signatures.

Lynn LaBell, leader of the late-started drive to recall Stein's slate-mates Treasurer Anne Bradley and Trustee Gene Daley, hopes she'll be able to accompany Gabbert to the county clerk's office with her recall petitions. But the Bradley-Daley recall petitions have not all been checked by Canton Clerk John Flodin.

County officials say it is crucial that both recall camps turn in their petitions within about a week of each other in order to avoid the possibility of having to schedule two separate recall elections—one for Stein and another for Bradley and Daley.

Deputy Clerk Tungate explained that once the county verifies that there is enough petitions for a recall election, it must act immediately to schedule an election and order ballots printed.

Mrs. LaBell is hoping the township clerk will finish checking the signatures against the Canton voter's roll before Friday afternoon, so she can rush the Bradley-Daley forms down to the City-County Building.

The county clerk's staff conducts a more comprehensive check of the recall petitions than the local clerk

does. The local clerk is only authorized to eliminate unregistered voters if the person signing is not registered to vote in that municipality. County officials will look for forgery, misrepresentation and incomplete information.

IN THE LOCAL check, Canton Clerk John Flodin determined that 1,280 signatures on Stein recall petitions were the names of registered Canton voters.

Only 1,251 valid signatures are needed to force a recall election against any Canton official. The figure is 25 per cent of the amount of people in Canton who voted for the governor in the last gubernatorial election.

Only the first batch of Bradley-Daley recall forms have been checked by the Canton clerk, said Doris Kelley, secretary to the clerk. In the first batch, she said 518 out of 595 Bradley recall signatures were judged valid and 532 out of 596 Daley signatures were deemed good.

Mrs. LaBell submitted a total of 1,719 signatures calling for Bradley's recall and 1,700 even against Daley. But most of those names have not yet been checked by the local clerk's office.

"We'll try to have it done for them by Friday," said Mrs. Kelley. "We're doing the best we can. We're anxious to cooperate with them, after all we don't want to see or pay for two separate recall elections either."

"I've completed the first submittal but I'm still in the process of checking the two later batches. There's no

way I can give you a full figure on the Bradley-Daley petitions."

Mrs. LaBell said she is confident the local check will show that her group has gathered at least the minimum 1,251 signatures against Bradley and Daley.

"There should be no problem with the number of signatures. I'm just getting worried about when they'll be done," said Mrs. LaBell. "We even wrote the correct spelling and addresses above names that were difficult to read. But I'm certain we have enough. We've gone 450 to 460 over as insurance."

As the seemingly-inevitable recall draws near, Stein, Daley and Bradley all say they'd like to see an election "the sooner the better."

Daley says he cannot understand the reason for some of the charges lodged against him by the recall forces.

"Where did I ever continually support huge tax expenditures for the Wayne County Sheriff Patrol?" asked Daley, who is a lieutenant with the department. "Funding or expenses for the sheriff has never come up before the township board, so I don't know what they're getting at."

"But I guess they could recall me because they didn't like the color of the tie I'm wearing. It doesn't have to make sense."

Charges against all three are similar. All three board members are accused of supporting more home construction, thus creating "a school tax crisis." All three are accused of attempting to limit public participation at township board meetings and all three are said to be soft on builders who "undermine property values."

## Credit cards are helpful if you can handle a budget

Plastic money is big business. From the lowly status of usury, credit has become a way of life for most Americans, and recent years have seen the credit business really hit its stride.

Convenience may be the major factor for the credit card boom, but at least one credit counselor believes plastic money is the culprit responsible for a lot of trouble.

"Don't get into the plastic game unless you can handle it," advises Jerry McTaggart, president of the American Association of Credit Counselors. And McTaggart, who operates several offices in the Detroit area, is convinced many Americans can't handle it.

He's seen a surprising rise in the number of suburbanites who come to his company for budget management, usually in a crisis situation.

"They're in a mess when they get here," he says. They may owe more money than their yearly incomes; their utilities are being shut off; and collection agencies are ringing their phones and knocking on their doors.

WE USED to get mainly low-income people," McTaggart says. "But today we have very big incomes and a lot of it from the suburbs—\$20,000, \$30,000, and \$40,000 incomes. That's big money, but often the guy owes \$20,000."

Many people are living on their gross incomes, rather than net incomes, McTaggart says. And plastic money makes it a lot easier to go over budget, he adds.

"When you get a credit card, you get a so-called limit," McTaggart explains. "But people walk in there and it's arbitrary money. There's no rela-

tion between the money they make and the object they're buying."

Credit itself is something that's not right," he maintains. "If you don't have the money, why are you buying it?"

Not everyone, however, shares McTaggart's feelings about credit.

"IT JUST seems to be a way of life," says Tony Flum, assistant administrative officer at National Bank of Detroit's metro-west regional office, which includes the Farmington area.

And Flum likes the convenience of buying on credit.

"I feel sorry for some of our parents who worked hard to provide us with educations but never had a chance to enjoy some of the things we have at an earlier stage in life."

People want something now, not when they can pay for it, Flum says. He also doesn't think the credit business should be blamed because a small number of people misuse it.

McTaggart disagrees about the number of people in credit trouble. "Our business has increased, and the amount of debt has increased substantially," he says.

"It's not only the person who's down and out. The average person uses credit as temporary cash. He says: 'I don't have the cash right now, but I'll pay the bill when it comes in.' The guy who doesn't should look at that 18 per cent interest charge as a penalty."

HOWEVER, Dr. William Dunkelberg, associate professor of economics at Purdue University in Indiana and associate director of the Credit

Research Center, says credit card abuse is not the problem some, like McTaggart, may think.

Dunkelberg contends there is no evidence to suggest that credit encourages spending.

"Everything gets misused," he says. "And credit is no exception. There's been no significant change in the ratio of debt to disposable income."

Credit growth has increased among higher income people, he says, but the proportion of income devoted to savings has similarly increased.

"The credit explosion has nothing to do with credit worthiness," Dunkelberg says. A 1970 study that will be updated this summer indicates that about 25 percent of charge accounts are used without paying finance charges—that is, the customer uses the charge as a convenience and pays the bill when due.

Another 25 per cent always pay finance charges, while the other half of the charge customers pay finance charges from time to time.

ances, equipment and fixtures, the two-year plan covers plumbing, wiring and heating and cooling systems, and the 10-year warranty is limited to major defects in the home's foundation, beams, roof and other elements of the supporting structure.

STEIN SAID the suggestion by Bundarin is nothing new. "This has been a concern of mine ever since I was elected to office last year. When I was campaigning in new subdivisions, many homeowners voiced their concern over the quality of work by builders."

There are some drawbacks, however, with the HOW plan. It doesn't cover completion if the builder decides to skip town, and there is a \$50 deductible and an arbitration process in the event of a disagreement over major structural defects.

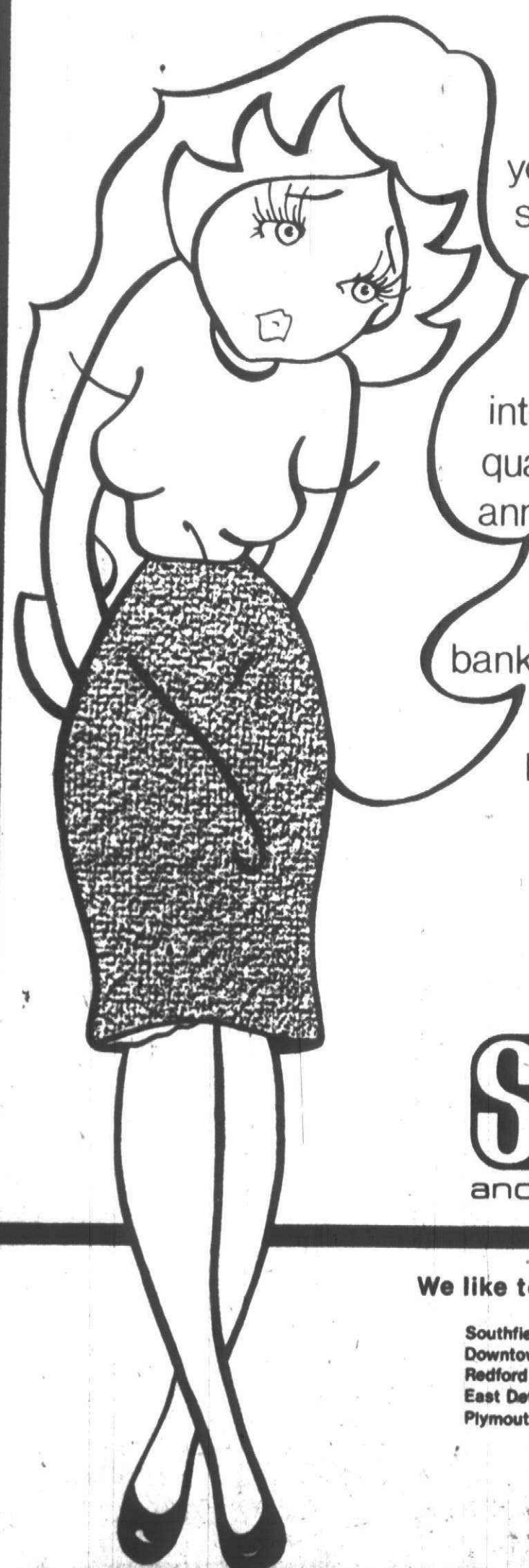
But the plan, at a cost of \$2 per \$1,000 (\$100 for a \$50,000 home), has proved quite effective, according to

the Southeastern Michigan Builders Association, which requires its members to offer the program. Only six of the 38 builders in Canton belong to the association.

Stein said the ball will get rolling once one of the township's attorney firms, Sempliner, Thomas and Guth, comes back to him with a response.

"These things take time," Stein said. "Legally, you have to be correct if you want to go after these people."

"We're going to take every precaution to insure that we don't step on any legal toes. A small municipality has to be careful on what it can legally demand of its builders."

STEIN SAID HE'LL MEET with all builders in Canton in the near future to hear their concerns of the issue. The supervisor will then approach the township board with appropriate proposals. Stein said there is no time limit set for the issue to go to the board.

Bundarin intends to inquire about the board's response to his homeowner warranty proposal at its regular meeting on Tuesday night. "If something isn't done, I'm going to make an issue of this thing and beat the board over the head with it."

Bundarin said he, too, was interested in the homeowner problem at the time of the election, but didn't

bring out the issue because he didn't want to make it political. Bundarin was unsuccessful as the Republican candidate for township supervisor.

Stein said the HOW plan is not the total answer to insuring quality craftsmanship. He would like to see the board require township builders to offer some type of safeguard to the individual homeowner, who would decide whether to bear the cost.

Whatever warranty plan emerges from the Stein administration will only cover new homes and will not hold the township responsible for assuring the patch-up work is done.

"The secret is to make the builders police themselves," Stein said.

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## Congressmen split on ban

The two U.S. Congressmen representing the Plymouth-Canton community split on the issue of whether federal funds should be used to pay for abortions.

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth), whose 2d District includes Plymouth and Plymouth Township,

voted in favor of the ban. Congressman William D. Ford (D-Taylor), whose 15th District includes Canton, voted against the restriction.

The amendments banning federal funds to pay for or to promote abortions also included a limit on the government's authority to implement af-

firmative action programs to make up for past cases of discrimination against women and minorities.

The ban allows use of federal funds for abortions only when a woman's life is endangered. This week the U.S. Supreme Court confirmed the constitutionality of three state laws banning publicly-financed abortions except when the mother's life is at stake.

Opponents of the ban argue it discriminates against low-income women because it makes voluntary abortion, a legal medical procedure, available only to those women who can afford it. A marked increase in deaths of women who turn to quacks to terminate a pregnancy is also feared by those opposed to the ban.

The affirmative action amendment prevents federal funds from being spent to enforce any ratio or quota related to race, creed, color, national origin or sex in the areas of employment or university admissions.

Pursell voted in favor of both bans, while Ford voted against both. The measures must now go to the U.S. Senate for positive action before being submitted to President Carter.

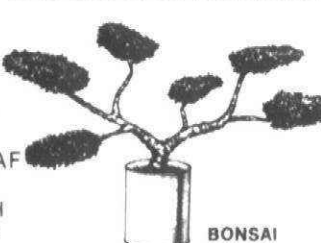
The amendments were attached to an appropriations bill for the Departments of Labor and Health, Education and Welfare.



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## Moehle seeks re-election to city commission seat

John M. Moehle is a candidate for re-election to the Plymouth City Commission in the August primary.

Moehle, 49, of 1279 W. Ann Arbor Trail, has a degree in mechanical engineering from Northwestern University and an MBA from the University of Detroit. He has been director of facilities with Booth Newspapers for eight years and has lived in Plymouth for 18 years.

He says he expects the campaign for the Aug. 2 primary to be lively because more city residents are beginning to realize the impact of city commission decisions on their welfare—their homes and their pocketbooks.

Moehle, known to many as Jack, has taken strong positions against certain major issues approved by the present city commission. Moehle voted against the 1977-78 city budget be-

cause "it is built upon a tax rate that is higher than it ought to be."

"Residential property assessment values were increased 17 per cent in the city this year while the Canton and Plymouth townships' values increased only about four per cent. Thus, the budget and its higher tax rate, plus the 17 per cent assessment increase, resulted in a two-step injustice with the homeowners paying even more of the biggest share of government costs."

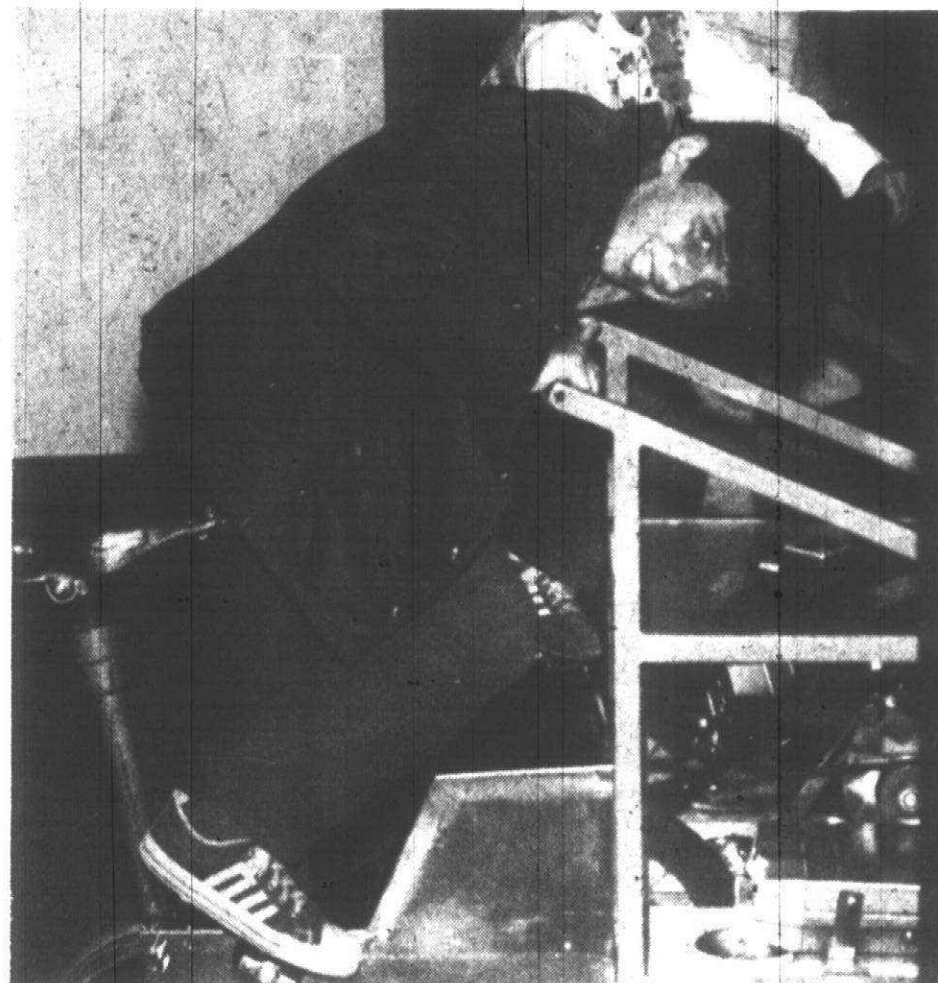
Moehle, who first won election to the city commission in 1973, previous served as trustee and vice-president of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education, a member of the City of Plymouth's Municipal Building Authority, and as business manager of the Plymouth Symphony. 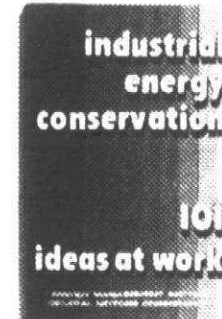
"We also have a computer system to turn production equipment on and off simultaneously so that some equipment won't be started up ahead and use up extra energy. The computer also gives us better control over our heating and ventilating equipment.

"We have a tight-knit group of people here, anxious to share their knowledge and experience. Some of us are graduate engineers; some have years of working knowledge. We're all concerned with the situation facing the country as far as energy and we're going to do our part."

## Project divided

# Central Lot work to begin

Work to improve the entrances to Central Parking Lot will begin next month, although the resurfacing of the lot won't begin until August.

The Plymouth City Commission voted 7-0 Monday night to authorize the taking of bids to improve the entrance and exit on Harvey Street and replace the ticket-splitter at the Ann Arbor Trail entrance.

The asphalt resurfacing and restriping of the lot will be delayed until August to give the city staff time to complete the engineering design work and to allow time to relocate some trees, electrical poles and a fire hydrant.

The resurfacing isn't expected to interfere with the Plymouth Fall Festival because the city will specify in the contract, when let, that work cannot be done during the week of the festival.

CITY MANAGER FRED YOCKEY reported that the merchants adjacent to the lot support the improvement plans with two reservations.

First, the merchants didn't want the ticket splitter at the Ann Arbor Trail entrance moved further into the interior of the lot. They said it would interfere with the unloading of trucks for the shops in the Mini Mall at Ann Arbor Trail and Main Street. The merchants also were concerned about 90-degree parking, expressing a preference for angle parking.

Yockey told commissioners that City Engineer Alan Gove surveyed the lot and agreed with merchants that the proposed location of the ticket-splitter would interfere with unloading functions.

"The traffic engineer recommended moving the ticket-splitter back to relieve back-up of traffic onto Ann Arbor Trail. But that would only gain space for one more car, so we don't gain enough in our opinion to warrant causing problems with unloading."

Also, the new ticket-splitter will work much better and keep traffic moving into the lot at about five seconds per car."

Yockey added that the question of angle parking will be examined in more detail as the final design of the lot is worked on next month. The topographic survey must be done yet, said Yockey. It will be at least until the first of August before engineering plans are completed.

"The city has a lot going now—paving contractors are in town now, work is started on the Tonquish Creek walkway and the ramp program. With all the inspections required for these jobs, our engineers just don't have the time now to do the design work on the parking lot."

Yockey added that the improvements to the Harvey entrance and exit is concrete work while asphalt will be used for the interior of the lot. "There's no real problems dividing the work up into two separate stages."

and bidding it out.

"Asphalt work can be done up to October, so we have enough time left. We'll just make sure the lot can be used for the fall festival. Asphalt, unlike concrete, can be used 12 hours after it's laid so there won't be any problems."

Asked if the Central Lot improvements would interfere with the proposal to deck the lot with the second level being used for a racquetball facility, Yockey said the initial work will have no effect.

"In fact, we probably can do the entire lot without doing anything that would have a material effect on the proposal for a racquetball facility, except maybe, on where the ramps might be located. But that's quite a ways off yet. The decision hasn't been made, and we don't have any idea how we'll even finance the project if it's deemed desirable. So we can go ahead with the Central Lot improvements."

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
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## \$3 million bus terminal is proposed

SEMTA will build a new bus terminal for western Wayne County and hopes the buses will be rolling out of it by late 1978.

The board of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority Tuesday approved paper work for the \$3.8 million project.

SEMTA spokesman Sid Alexander said the site will be in Inkster, on Henry Ruff Road south of Michigan Avenue.

NO LOCAL opposition was encountered, in contrast to what happened when SEMTA proposed to build the terminal on Ford Road in Garden City. That was blocked by strong residential protests.

At a recent public hearing in Inkster, Alexander said, "only three people showed up."

The federal government will provide \$3.04 million of the total project cost with the state kicking in \$760,000. SEMTA has no independent taxing authority.

The terminal will employ 195 persons, including drivers. It will house the entire western Wayne County operation, said Alexander.

INITIAL CAPACITY will be 88 buses, "with plans for expansion," he said.

The new terminal will replace an old Metro bus line terminal in Dearborn that is badly outdated, he added. That property, bounded by a railroad track on one side and residences on the others, has been rezoned.

SEMTA General Manager Larry Salci said Louis G. Redstone Associates, Detroit, was low qualified bidder at \$81,600 for the architectural and engineering work on the terminal.

Tuesday's meeting was the final one for two suburban women members of the SEMTA board, Julie Evans of Birmingham was defeated for renomination by a caucus of Oakland County cities and villages. Her replacement was to be named Wednesday night.

## Driveway probe ends

Former Canton Township Supervisor Robert Greenstein has been given a clean bill of health on charges that he misused public funds.

State Police Sgt. George Bays, who investigated the case, said there was no evidence to support the charge that Greenstein had improved his home driveway at township expense.

Tom Hunt, a former department of public works employee, said he spread 15 tons of limestone on Greenstein's driveway while he was in the employ of the township and had been paid for his work out of township funds. Hunt made his charges in a signed letter last fall.

Bays said he examined the driveway and there was no way that amount of limestone could have been spread on it. He also said he found no record of the alleged payments to Hunt.

Greenstein said he was pleased with

Bay's decision. "I am of course glad that the people of the township will know I'm not a criminal."

"But I'm sorry (Supervisor) Harold Stein felt the need to drag up this old chestnut to begin with. They (the charges) were made during the election for political reasons."

Stein unseated Greenstein in last November's election.

Although no formal charges were made, Bays also was looking into the possibility that some township residents were over-billed for weed-cutting services last summer.

Both Bruce Philips, the township's ordinance officer, and A.R. Vancleve, the private contractor who did the cutting, took life detector tests which cleared them.

Bays said he could find no evidence of criminal intent, but added that there was shoddy bookkeeping.

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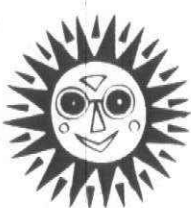
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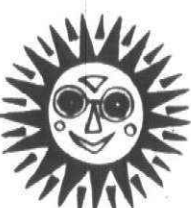

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# Daniels Den

Had an interesting discussion last week about growing "abuses" of the sick-leave policy in the public sector and how the problem, in part, is rooted in attitudes encouraged in years past by public administrators.

It was one of those free-wheeling talks that jumped from the public to the private sector without any conclusions being reached, except that sick leave is like a snowball rolling downhill—once it's instituted, there's very little which can be done to limit the size of the creature.

And then Monday night the matter of sick leave popped up on the Plymouth City Commission agenda with commissioners asked to vote on sick leave policies for DPW and general salary employees.

**THE DISCUSSION** last week was about public employment in general, not Plymouth in particular—not at all.

It all began with the comment by a management consultant that sick leave benefits is one of the largest problems facing personnel administrators today in the public sector.

While it makes sense to provide sick days so employees who are ill won't lose pay, the benefit often is abused. Many employees take sick days just because they are available, not because they actually are sick. If the policy is to allow five sick days a

year, the employee will be "sick" exactly five days a year; if 12 days are allowed, the sickness will strike exactly 12 days a year.

The problem is that there's really no effective way to enforce a sick leave policy. The naive administrator could require a note from the doctor, but any employee who cannot get a note from his doctor ought to find a new doctor. I don't mean to suggest there might be something wrong with medical ethics, but a man can be found "unfit" to work for a multitude of reasons.

Some public agencies will allow employees to accumulate unused sick leave days, but cap it. Others allow employees to receive cash at the end of the year for unused sick days.

The trick involved is to encourage employees to stay at home when they are sick, but to discourage those employees who'll take a sick day just because it's provided by policy.

**INVOLVED IN** last week's discussion was a friend who is a union steward for a public agency in Wayne County.

He admitted there are abuses of the sick leave policy, but pointed out that the roots of the abuse go back to the attitudes of management in the days

when public employees weren't unionized.

In those days, public employees were paid far below the comparable prevailing wage in the private sector. To attract and retain competent employees, public administrators attempted to put together a fringe benefit package which would compensate for the poor wages paid.

And so public employees, in many areas, were led to believe that sick days were a special fringe benefit in lieu of better wages, to be taken as if they were paid vacation days. The practice developed, either with public administrators winking, turning their backs, or encouraging it.

As time passed, and public employees organized, the wage picture has improved and is today more competitive with the private sector. The fringe benefits package, of course, has remained. And so has the attitudes and practices.

I think my friend is right, and I haven't yet found an experienced administrator or employee deny that was or could've been the case.

What I find fascinating isn't the abuses, but the historical reason (if it's true) why the practice developed in the first place. I wonder how many years will pass, if ever, before the impact of tradition wears off.

It seems a fitting place to begin this series by reviewing some of the programs and resources available to seniors in Plymouth and Canton.

**IF YOU ARE** in search of a specific type of service, such as obtaining sick-room equipment or appliances like walkers and canes, call Bill Henry of Our House at 455-4907 in Plymouth.

Bill also can tell you who to talk to or what agency to contact regarding social security, medicare, medicaid and tax matters. He even has a volunteer who will guide you in making out a will. Bill also can supply information about social clubs and church activities.

Brenda Pollack, Canton's recreation director, tells us Canton residents can call the United Fund sponsored community information service, toll-free, at 1-800-552-1183 for information and referral concerning the various services offered among county and state agencies.

If you are 60 or older, you are eligible to participate in the Wayne County Hot Lunch Nutrition Program. If your spouse isn't yet 60 you still qualify. Donations of 50 cents are appreciated.

In Canton, reservations for lunch and transportation are necessary at least 24 hours in advance. Canton residents should call Marie Napier, site manager, at 397-2777. Lunch is served promptly Monday through Thursday at noon and Friday at 11:30 a.m. in the Canton Recreation Building, 44237 Michigan Avenue at the corner of Sheldon.

Plymouth senior citizens should call Evelyn Szostek, site manager, at 453-9703 from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at least 48 hours in advance for lunch reservations. A balanced hot lunch is served Monday through Friday at noon in Tonquish Creek Manor, 1160 Sheridan.

Sometimes entertainment is provided as a special noontime amusement. If you need transportation contact the Canton, Northville, Plymouth YMCA.

Take our meals also are available for anyone unable to come in or ride the YMCA van.

Both lunch programs offer varied menus and an opportunity to get out and mix with others and socialize.



They also sponsor day trips. Canton diners will be bused to Frankenmuth July 14 and have lunch at one of the famous German family-style eateries.

And on June 22 Plymouth people will take an all-day bus trip to Flint for lunch and a look-see at the Huckleberry Narrow Gauge Railroad. For reservations call the site manager in your community.

**THE YMCA OF** Canton, Northville, Plymouth offers four helpful services to senior citizens 60 years and older who receive social security benefits.

These include escort service to and from local doctors and dentists, grocery, drug store, hair dresser, Tonquish Creek nutrition site post office, and other such errands.

The 'Y' van operates from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Several days notice is necessary, however, for efficient scheduling.

Another service is help with lawn mowing and snow removal, in season, and light home chores. For those who have visual handicaps, volunteers are available to assist with reading and writing. And a daily phone call for seniors who live alone and would like to chat is your's for the asking.

Each of these services is free through Title III federal funding. There also are counseling services available on request for senior citizens by calling 453-2968.

**FOR THOSE SENIOR CITIZENS** interested in gardening and thinking ahead to filling the larder for winter, there are a number of plots available in Northville.

The land is located between Five and Six Mile Roads. Each garden plot is 20 by 35 feet. The ground already has been tilled and is ready for seeding. Michigan State University will have three master gardeners on call throughout the summer for advice and consultation. Call Hans Lahr, senior citizen's coordinator in Northville, at 349-1300 for details, 453-0750.

The library also has a copy machine where you can have original documents duplicated for 10 cents a page. The librarians will be happy to help you use the machines.

Canton senior citizens can check out large print books and periodicals for two-week periods. Subjects available include mysteries, biographies, hobbies, current events, adventure, and religion. The Canton Recreation Building is open from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

**YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE** for the food stamp program of Wayne County if you fall within certain income standards.

According to the Department of Social Services, a one-person household with a maximum monthly income of \$245 or a two-person household with a monthly income of \$322 could qualify. For more information call 1-265-3103.

And did you know you can buy post-stamps by mail instead of making an in-person visit? Call the post office, GL3-6110, for particulars.

A beautiful Indian princess sat one day, in her tepee, combing and braiding her long black hair.

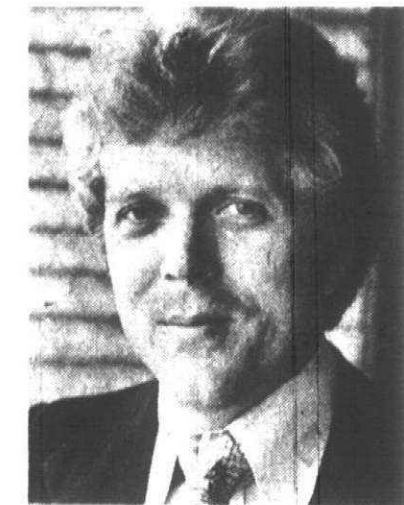

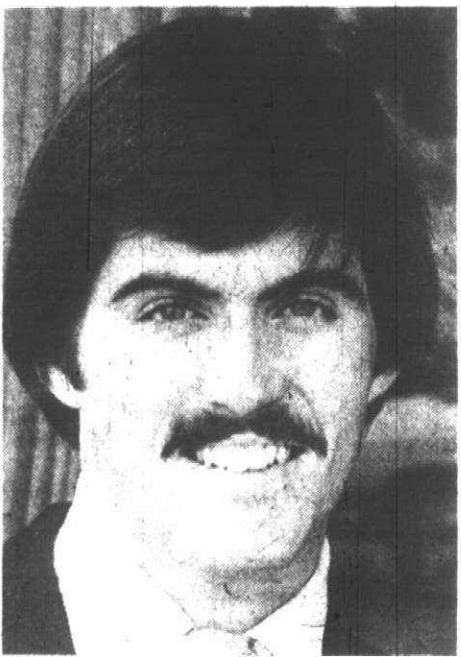
## Plymouth Hilton gets top rating from AAA

Long noted for their generosity when it comes to charity events the bowling proprietors of Michigan and the state's 400,000 sanctioned bowlers have set a new goal of \$100,000 for the 1977-78 season.

Meeting in annual convention this week at the Dearborn Hyatt Regency, proprietors announced that this year's event just closed netted \$63,000 that would be shared among five or six charities in the near future.

It was announced that 93,000 bowlers had taken part in the statewide charities tournament. But, with a membership of 400,000 sanctioned bowlers, all sides are hoping that the new goal can be reached. The events open each year in January and bowlers are asked to donate \$1 as an entry fee and then use the league score for the evening. The event has proved popular ever since its inception.

**ANOTHER MOHACSI** is moving into the bowling spotlight. This time it is Mark, son of Mary Mohacsi, who recently was crowned the area's bowling queen and captain of the all-city team.

Mark has qualified for an all-expenses paid trip to Parkersburg, W.Va. to compete in the eastern central regionals of the All-America Youth Championships.

**WITH THREE WEEKS** remaining in the Fred Wolf Ladies Singles, the largest tournament of its kind in the area, Sheila Shields, of Warren, is holding down first place with a count of 1107 that includes a spot of 150 pins.

The big news of the week, though, was furnished by Sharon Brooks, of Toledo, when she rolled an all time high single for the tournament with a

280 game. With her spot of 23 pins she officially was credited with a 303 game.

After bowling games of 153 and 168, she opened the third game with a strike. She then covered a spare and followed with 10 strikes. It was a career high for her.

**ONE OF THE** most exciting finishes of the entire bowling year enabled Jack Getzen, of Grand Ledge, to win the monthly meeting of the Michigan Majors Association.

Coming into the final round, Dave Diomed, of the all-star league, had to defeat Getzen by 18 pins to take the title and he closed with five strikes for a 237. Getzen then needed two strikes to remain on top. So he calmly threw three strikes for a 227 and the title. He won seven of his 12 games and averaged 209 over the entire route.

**ED DUDEK**, one of Livonia's top league bowlers, became only the second man since the inception of the event five years ago to win the state master's monthly tournament two months in a row.

He did it by pacing the field at the Colonial Lanes in Flushing this month after winning the previous month at Drakeshire Lanes in Farmington.

**HIGH SCORES** sometimes pop up in the most unexpected places.

Take the case of Steve Conner, a 182-average bowler at Wonderland Lanes. Bowling in the mixed league he suddenly put together games of 278, 243 and 198 for a 719.

In the men's trio circuit, Jerry Lash was high man with a 693 gained on games of 266, 206 and 221.

**WESTERN WAYNE COUNTY** is going to have a ladies classic league during prime time next season.

The ladies are going to bowl at Northville Lanes on Wednesday evenings at 7 p.m. for a top prize of \$800.

According to present plans, each team will have four members, but will increase to five if there is a demand. Those women interested are asked to call Nancy Goley at 349-3737.

**BRUCE ROGERS** topped the Wednesday mixed leagues at Garden Lanes with a 569 while Gerri McCloskey, a 128 average bowler, paced the ladies with a 525 to beat Judy Collins by five pins.

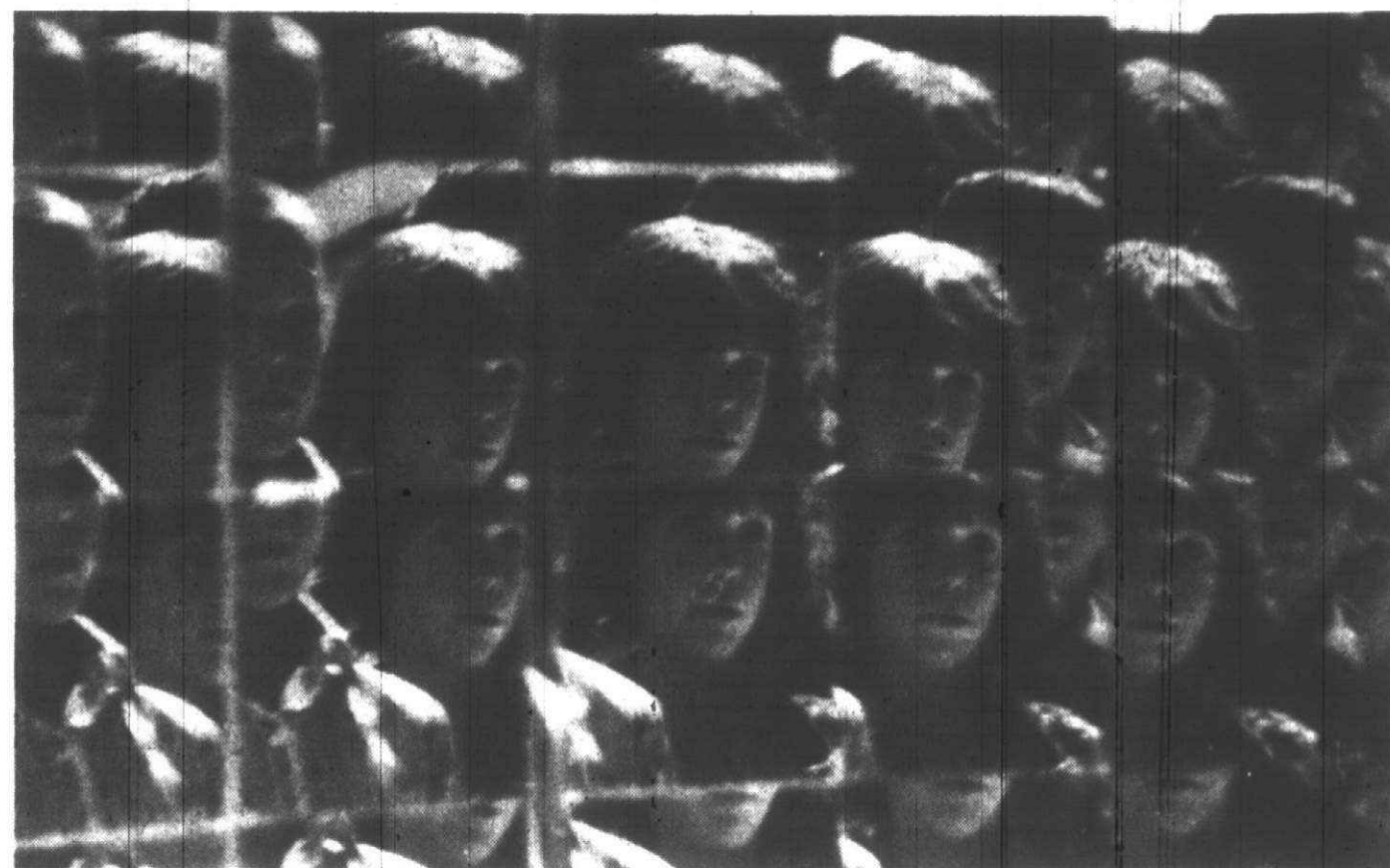

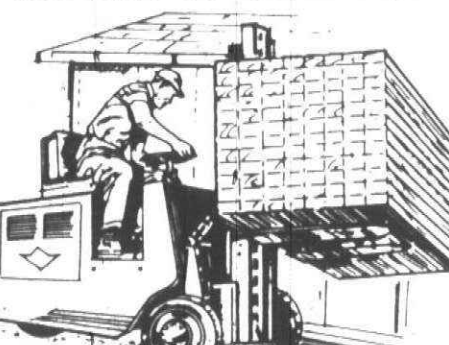

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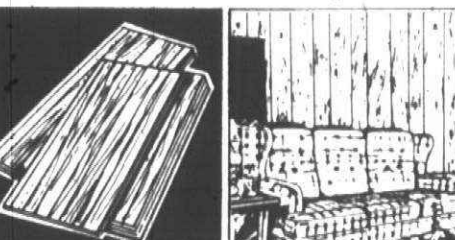

# Brown's ill-conceived 'Suburbia' is the joke

What comes to mind when the word "suburbia" is mentioned?

Patios, above-ground pools and shopping centers?

Well, to hear State Rep. Tom Brown (D-Westland) talk, "suburbia" would be the name of a new county composed of western Wayne communities—a county completely separate from big, bad Detroit and its immediate environs.

But the name of the new county is not the biggest joke involved.

The ill-conceived proposal of Brown calling for an out-county secession from Wayne should be viewed as a transparent political ploy rather than an idea to be taken seriously.

The real intent of Brown's upcoming legislation is not to create an 84th county but rather to threaten doing so.

As a good representative should, Brown has become vocal about increasing and disproportionate charges for Wayne County water and sewer rates. Brown should be encouraged for his stand that Wayne County services and institutions are becoming increasingly unresponsive to the growing demands of western Wayne residents. This is fine.

## Who's ruling home?

We have been astounded—amazed—stunned at the campaign of the Wayne County sheriff's deputies to grab jurisdiction of the Detroit area free-ways from the Michigan State Police.

Oh the deputies' desire to keep jobs isn't what's astounding, amazing or stunning. It's their crass appeal to the principle of "home rule," their exotic argument that the state police are somehow invading our private world like the redcoats of old and taking something away from us. The deputies' union has even bought commercials with the voice of Sheriff Bill Lucas making these home rule arguments.

And where were the deputies and the sheriff when progressive state legislators were attempting to pass a meaningful county home rule bill? Where were the deputies and sheriff when progressive county commissioners were trying to get Wayne County to adopt a county executive system? Either doing nothing or dragging their feet. In truth, "home rule" means nothing to them. It's politics, and it's unsavory. We feel much safer with the state police, thank you.

BUT HOW CAN Brown introduce legislation calling for the secession of western Wayne communities and still keep a straight face? It would seem that Brown has been around long enough to absorb the understanding that it cannot work.

The largest stumbling block—or should we call it The Great Wall—is that the seceding county must reimburse the mother county for all capital assets in its territory. To cover those assets, the County of Suburbia must come up with millions upon millions of dollars (from us taxpayers) to purchase the county roads, parks, hospital buildings, storm drains, sheriff headquarters, jail facilities, sewer and water equipment and services and on and on.

Imagine how much it would cost the constituents of Suburbia to purchase Metropolitan Airport and Edward Hines Park, which are both located within the boundaries of Brown's county.

Suburbia residents would be paying an astronomical tax bill for their secession, an expense far greater than the present high charges paid for sewer and water.

What is distressing about Brown's trial balloon is that it will probably find support among people who regard the City of Detroit as a rotten core that must be cut from the rest of the apple.

AND THOUGH it will be hotly denied, racism would play a part in encouraging secession from what Brown calls "Detroit-dominated" county government.

Western Wayne taxpayers shouldn't be expected to shoulder the financial burden of the City of Detroit, and Rep. Brown should fight hard for more out-county representation on the transportation, water and sewer authorities. But, at the same time, the western suburbs of Wayne County lose time and effectiveness through petty in-fighting and competition.

We are one county, one people, with similar needs, such as police protection, parks and municipal services.

Regardless of the demerits and merits of forming a new, separate county, the fact is that the County of Suburbia will never be born. To carry this metaphor further, the miscarriage will occur early in the pregnancy. Rep. Brown, predictably, will proclaim that the promising embryo was aborted by the powers that be in the City-County Building and their sympathetic cohorts in SEMTA, SEMCOG and the AFL-CIO.

Brown should spend his legislative energy in a more practical pursuit.

# Is SC board dominated? If so, the hand is light

The last time anyone checked, Livonia School District had about half the population in the Schoolcraft College District; Plymouth and Garden City had about 20 per cent apiece; Clarenceville and Northville had about five per cent apiece.

After the June 13 election, Livonia will have six seats on the Schoolcraft board; Plymouth one (a transplanted Livonian); Garden City one; Clarenceville and Northville zero.

In that election, voters replaced two retiring Plymouth residents with Livonians. One of those Plymouthites, the outspoken Arch Vallier, warned: "You (the board) have a real problem with Plymouth. Packing the board with Livonians didn't help. There's no feeling for Schoolcraft in Plymouth. People say 'it's nuthin' but a Livonia college'."

AT FIRST GLANCE, the board does seem loaded with Livonians—"packed" is hardly a fair word. Yet there are mitigating factors which ought not to be ignored.

For years the Schoolcraft board was dominated by the smaller districts, and there was no complaint from Plymouth about malapportionment. In 1966-67 the Schoolcraft board had three Plymouth residents (two elected at-large), which meant a district with 20 per cent of the population had 37.5 per cent of the power. Livonia, with 50 per cent of the population, had two seats, or 25 per cent of the power. If one wanted to make excuses, one could say that in 1977-79 Livonia will get "compensatory representation" to make up for all the years it got the shaft.

After the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in a Missouri case that "one person, one vote" had to apply to community college boards, the Schoolcraft College board knew full well it would have to be reapportioned because its method of electing one trustee from each K-12 district, regardless of size, was patently unfair to Livonia. The board should have gone immediately to the Michigan Legislature to seek an amendatory law to bring Schoolcraft in compliance with the U.S. Constitution.

But that board—with Jane Moehle of Plymouth as chairperson—sat back and did nothing. This forced the New Democratic Coalition of Livonia to go to court and seek reapportionment. From a consent decree came the current system of electing all eight Schoolcraft trustees at-large.

The two new trustees from Livonia elected June 13 won because they ran strong races all across the Schoolcraft district; they weren't provi-

nicial candidates. Harry Greenleaf, previously a Republican Party leader, ran third in both Plymouth and Northville school districts. Len Wozniak, ran a solid fourth both places.

In contrast, G.J. (Jack) Bologna, the lone Plymouthite among nine candidates, ran first on his home turf but slipped to a dismal seventh in Clarenceville, Garden City and Livonia. And Laura Toy of Livonia would have been elected if only Clarenceville, Garden City and Livonia had been voting, but her totals fell off badly in Plymouth and Northville, and she ran fifth district-wide.

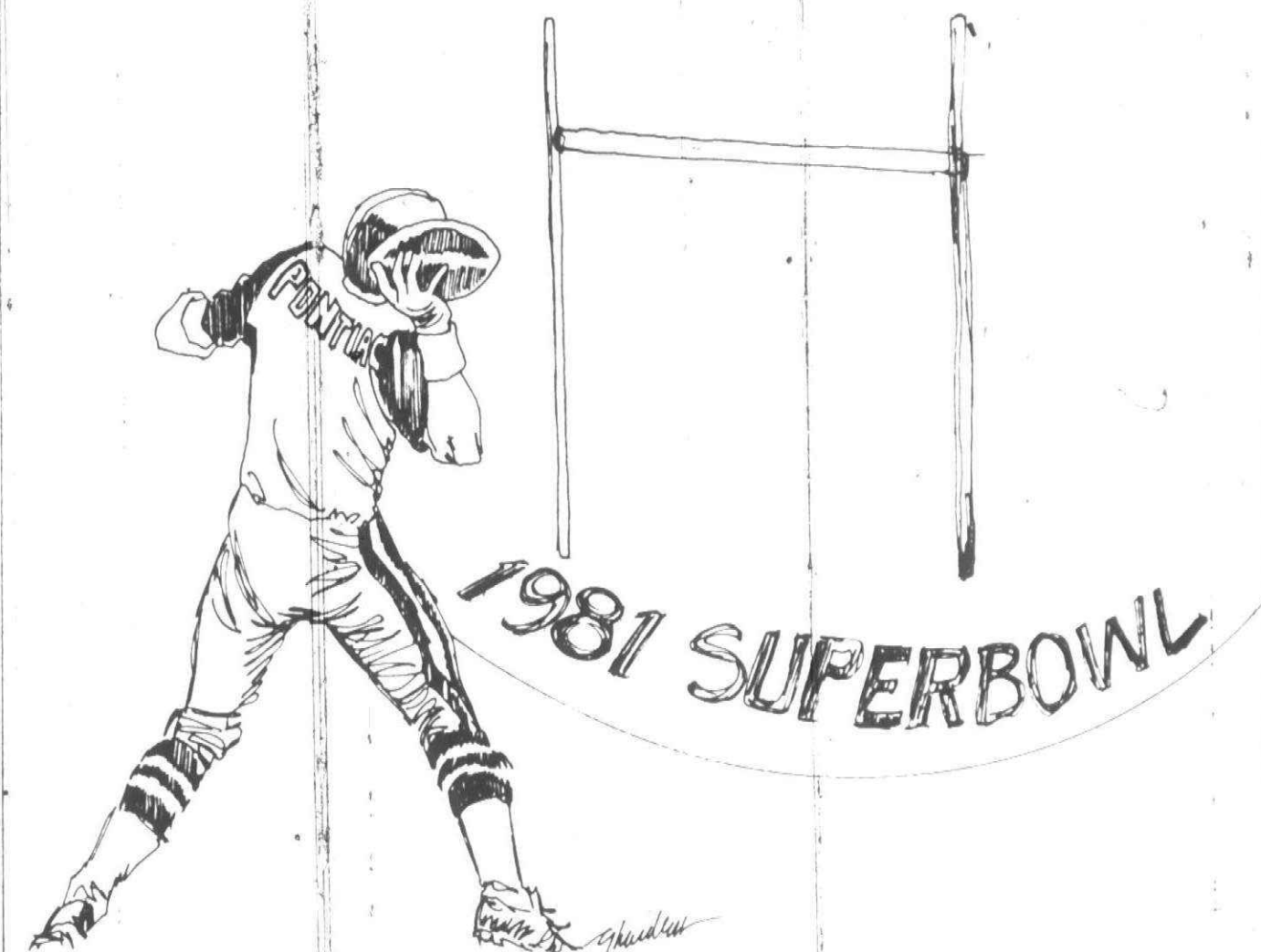
The moral: You have to be well-known everywhere to get elected in the Schoolcraft district; Wozniak and Greenleaf played by the rules.

Historically, the real reason Plymouth and Northville feared a Livonia-dominated Schoolcraft board was not so much that Livonians are low-caste upstarts. Rather, it's that the few Livonians who were winning were pretty liberal—Jack LaRue, Rosina Raymond, Paul Kadish, James Boswell, Nancie Blatt, Mark McQuesten. Lately, however, a more moderate political breed has been coming out of Livonia—Ron Cowden, Wozniak, Greenleaf.

The Kadish-led board of 1977 is showing far more concern for the little districts than the Moehle-led board of 1971 showed for the big district. The 1977 board asked the legislature to expand its size to nine, a move that would have let Bologna be elected. Trustee Raymond has expressed support for a system of single-member sub-districts, which would guarantee representation for the little districts. Mrs. Raymond has further committed herself to appointing a person from a small district if a vacancy should occur.

If folks in Plymouth, Northville and Clarenceville learned their lessons as well as the Livonians learned theirs, the geographical imbalance on the Schoolcraft board can be corrected in 1979.

# Silverdome's foot in door for 1981 economic boom

A paper in Detroit said, "Pontiac loses Super Bowl."

I was in New York last week as part of the contingent making the presentation to the National Football League hoping to bring the Super Bowl to Pontiac's Silverdome in 1981. Despite the negative media reports, Pontiac far from lost.

The NFL awarded the sites for 1979 and 1980 to Miami and Pasadena. The final decision on 1981 won't be made until next year.

The NFL makes site selections only two years in advance.

In selecting a site for the Super Bowl, the NFL would like a stadium that can hold at least 75,000 fans. Other requirements are that the stadium be in a warm climate or be temperature-controlled, according to Pete Rozelle, NFL commissioner.

The 75,000 seats are needed because the league gives 20,000 to the home team, 15,000 each to the contenders and 1,000 each to the other 25 teams in the league.

THE SILVERDOME petitioned for the 1981 game because its boosters wanted time to maximize the economic development that can come with the Super Bowl.

Last year, it was calculated that the Super Bowl at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena brought \$80 million to the Los Angeles economy over a two-week period.

It seems incredible, but this is what is spent and resented by the fans and the people who provide services for the game.

To bring the game to a certain area, officials must provide practice fields. In cold weather climates, this means indoor facilities. We know that the Silverdome can provide facilities for one team, but a second location had to be found for the other team.

The answer was to place a tent or bubble over the Lions' practice field at a cost of \$30,000.

Fifteen thousand hotel rooms are needed, and while the rooms are available in the metropolitan Detroit area, by waiting until 1981 some new first

class hotels will be constructed closer to the stadium.

Pontiac itself is going through a downtown revitalization, and the additional time will allow the city to adequately prepare for the onslaught of people.

BECAUSE PONTIAC can offer everything that any other place can offer the day of the game, two things must happen to get the game here in the area.

First, we must convince the owners of the NFL that the fans deserve to have it near where most of the fans live once in a while.

After our experience in New York, I believe that we can convince them to bring it here.

# Save gas--if you dare

Our newspapers are a business, and like any American business we've been concerned—even worried—about how to save on our energy bill. Our employee publication, "Fringes," asked for energy-saving ideas—and did we get them!

Here's one I'd like to share with you, one that I haven't made up my own mind about yet. It came from Pat Sanford, a jovial and articulate woman who works in our advertising department.

What do you think of her proposal?

"IF, IN FACT, there is a dire need of gasoline conservation in America," she writes, "the crisis could be alleviated by raising the driver licensing age to 18."

Energy conservation can be achieved by reducing gasoline consumption, and there is a great waste in the use of automobiles by the senior high school set from 16- to 18-years-old.

When a person reaches age 16, it is mandatory among their peer group to take possession of a car, either their own or the family second car, to partake in the maturity rites of American Life. These rites consist of driving anywhere and everywhere so others of the peer group may observe and be observed. The common term is "cruising," and it can be seen primarily around neighborhoods, local parks, fast-food chains and in the vicinity of schools.

Schools in fact, are presently taking on the appearance of mammoth car lots, with some districts being forced to hire parking lot attendants to oversee the multitude of vehicles contained therein. Meanwhile, the school buses roll on half-full.

"THE ARGUMENT is raised that these 16- to 18-year-olds need a car for work. It is amazing, however, how much of the money earned at their jobs is actually required for the use and maintenance of the car.

"In other words, the car is necessary to hold the job, while the job does little more than support the car.

home area of the student, which would indicate a strong possibility of either walking or bicycling to work.

Americans of all ages are guilty to some extent of misuses of vehicles and the resultant waste of gasoline. It is ridiculous, however, to equate the use of an automobile by an adult driving to his chosen occupation for the purpose of supporting his family with the use of a car driven by a student to a part-time job well within walking distance whose sole purpose is to keep the car in operating condition for pleasure purposes.

These young people have never sought out public transportation, nor will they ever do so, as they have known nothing but the privately-owned passenger vehicle.

Public transportation is a reality to most adults who grew up in the days of such systems as the DSR (now DOT) and similar systems, but will never be a solution to younger generations unless drastic changes occur in their mode of living early in life.

"A LICENSING plan with a minimum age of 18 is neither unfair nor un-American, but would be a positive step in solving the ever-increasing problem of gasoline shortages.

"While undoubtedly proving unpopular with the 16- to 18-year-olds affected, it would neither ruin their lives nor infringe on their personal liberties.

"Indeed, it might actually solve more problems than that of conservation. But conservation would definitely be affected by this measure."

IT JUST SO happened that the big rock was officially in three states. If one sat in the center he would be sitting in New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania. And no summer was complete unless we visited there and then proudly announced that we had spent our vacation in three states.

"That must have been unusual," our friend replied, while looking up and down the river as the big freighters seemed to be holding a parade. But if you take a good look around here you'll see a most unusual sight."

Then, with a smile, he asked, "Where else can you get a better view of yesterday meeting tomorrow? Where else can you look across a stream into a foreign country and realize that you are sitting on the most peaceful border in the world?"

Speaking with the same seriousness as one would expect from a chamber of commerce official he went on, "Where else would you see big freighters carrying on as in the days of yore while big airliners pass overhead. That's yesterday meeting tomorrow."

While we were sitting there with the sun slowly sinking, he pointed to the high arches of the Blue Water Bridge that seemed at the moment to be jammed with traffic in both directions.

"There is another case," he said, "for if you turn from the bridge you can see the barges and ferries carrying people across the river and back. That, too, is another case of yesterday meeting tomorrow."

THEN AS DARKNESS fell the multitude of

lights pierced the sky over the refineries in Sarnia, Ontario, just across the river.

But he also is serving as a guide to some tourist who is eager to land a fine catch of pickerel. The Indian sure knows where they are."

Talk about unusual sights on a vacation, the St. Clair River is filled with them.

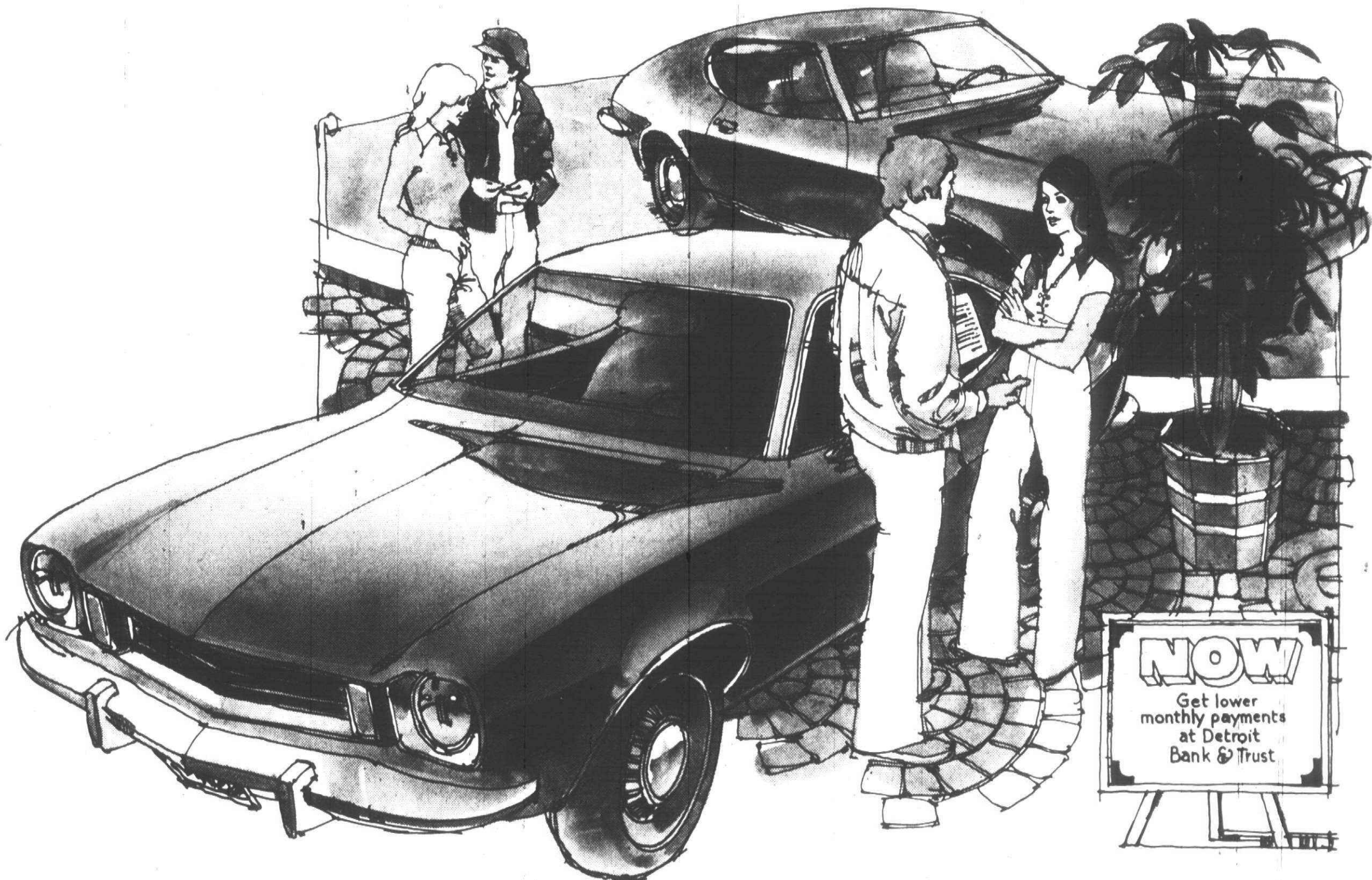

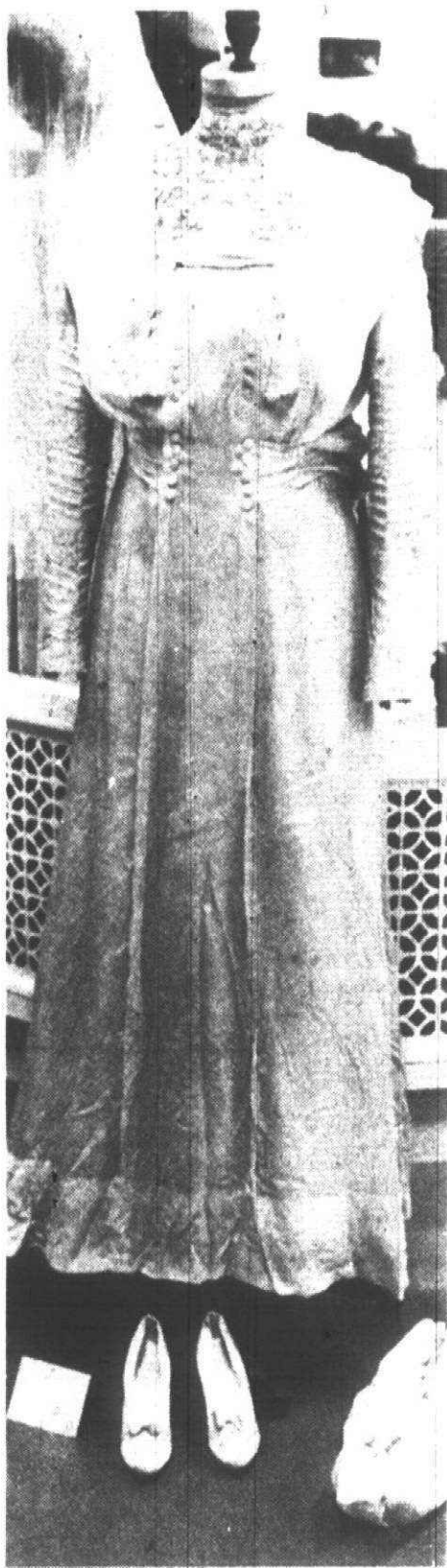
"There was a large turnout from Livonia," said Joan Funkhouser, who runs the Tuesday night duplicate games at the Plymouth Cultural Center.

# Club can add to twin pleasures

"One set is an adventure; the second would be a catastrophe."

The speaker was Lynn Lyon, newly elected president of Western Wayne County Mothers of Twins Club—the "club where God chooses the members."

"We have really enjoyed them," said Lynn referring to Ross and Greg, their 8-year-old fraternal twins.

"Sometimes it seems the mothers of twins club is almost like an underground organization. Mothers ask, 'How do I get in?'"

"We really want to help new mothers. Our brochures are at every Chamber of Commerce office and we welcome new members."

She added that the organization has tips for new mothers. It is best not to wait until the babies are several months old. She quoted a frantic call: "I have 3-month-old twins. Will I make it?"

She suggests women who are expecting twins join the club before they are

born. "There are so many small things that can save time. There's the bath water, for instance. The babies can be bathed in the same water; there's no need to change the water for each child."

**THE CLUB** sponsors workshops and discussions to help mothers of twins.

The topics include the twins relationship with the singleton in the family and each other. When they start school, there is the decision of whether or not they should be in the same classroom.

"Some are better apart and some are better together," said Mrs. Lyon. "The mother, not the school, has the sensitivity to decide which is better for her children."

The club sends out questionnaires which aid in national studies of twins. The 1975 state surveys revealed some interesting statistics.

The averages were based on 482 sets of twins, five sets of triplets and one quadruple birth.

Of the multiple births, 83 were identical boys; 74 fraternal boys, 111 were boy and girl, 82 identical girls, and 82 fraternal girls.

Average time span between the birth of multiples was five to six minutes but the time did range from no time to two hours.

**SIX OF THE** mothers were twins and 16 of the fathers.

Average age of the mothers at birth of twins was 26-27. Average age of the fathers was 29, but the fathers ranged in age from 18 to 55.

Generally twins, triplets and quads were the last pregnancy.

Weights of the multiples ranged from two pounds, three ounces and two pounds, six ounces, to nine pounds, five ounces and seven pounds, 10 ounces. The average was six to 6½ pounds. The largest discrepancies in weights were eight pounds, nine ounces and five pounds, four ounces, and six pounds two ounces and three pounds, two ounces.

There were 129 premature births and 293 full terms. Thirty-eight of the full terms were overdue.

**ARE THERE UNCANNY** similarities in twin behavior?

Mrs. Lyons says, "Definitely."

Even in relatively simple things. A trip to the dentist will reveal cavities in the same tooth. If one needs a lift on a shoe, the other soon will need the same thing. If one has an ear infection, it is best to check the other's. Even though he has not been complaining, the doctor usually discovers an infection same ear.

"It is weird," she said. "And with mirror twins—if one breaks a right arm, the other will break the left."

She said mothers of twins stress not dressing alike and other marks of individualism.

This is a change from the way it used to be, she said. She noted discussion panels and conventions of

adult twins reveal middle-aged twins still dressed alike and wore similar hairdos. "They were so alike, many of them never married. They had no world outside themselves."

**BESIDES BEING** a built-in exchange for twin furniture, toys, go-carts and information, there is a social side to the Mothers of Twins Club.

There are picnics, luncheons, dinners and banquets.

Members aid in research and meet four times a year with their state representatives in Lansing.

As Lynn Lyon begins her year as president of the local chapter, her first aim is to reach all the mothers of twins in the area and welcome them to the club.

# Amy Carter doll house comes to town

Last Jan. 17, television screens and newspapers carried pictures of then President-elect Jimmy Carter and one of his warehouse workers carrying Amy Carter's doll house to a truck. The little white house was being moved to THE White House in Washington D.C.

A duplicate of Amy's doll house arrived in Plymouth last week. It now is on display, and for sale, at Muriel's Doll House on Penniman Avenue.

Muriel and Art Calhoun stopped in Plains, Ga. on their way home from Florida last March. And because dolls are their business, they were in-

terested in meeting the builder of Amy's doll house.

They visited Carter campaign headquarters and talked to Rosalyn Carter's mother who directed the Calhouns to Peggy Joyce Whitt of Windmill Farms between Oglethorpe and Ellaville. Before they left, the Calhouns were the sole U.S. distributors of Mrs. Whitt's handmade doll houses.

**AMY CARTER'S** doll house was a Christmas gift from her grandmother, Lillian Carter.

Mrs. Carter discovered the Cape

Cod doll house with its green shutters just nine days before Christmas. The six rooms were papered and painted but there were still hours of work to be done before it was completed. It was delivered to the Carter home at 11 p.m. Christmas Eve.

"The Whitt's live on a lovely farm," said Muriel Calhoun. "Mrs. Whitt was a lab technician. She gave up her work to devote all her time to making doll houses and furniture."

"She led us back to a sharecropper's house which she uses as a workshop."

Peggy Joyce Whitt and her husband

Ellison have nine children and one grandson. Ellison Whitt helps his wife in her carpentry—he is assistant director of the South Georgia Technical School in Americus.

**THE CALHOUNS** have been expecting the arrival of the doll house for more than a month.

"She (Mrs. Whitt) was bitten by a black widow spider and had to spend three weeks in the hospital," said Muriel, explaining the delay.

"I imagine she got the spider bite in the sharecropper's cabin where she works."

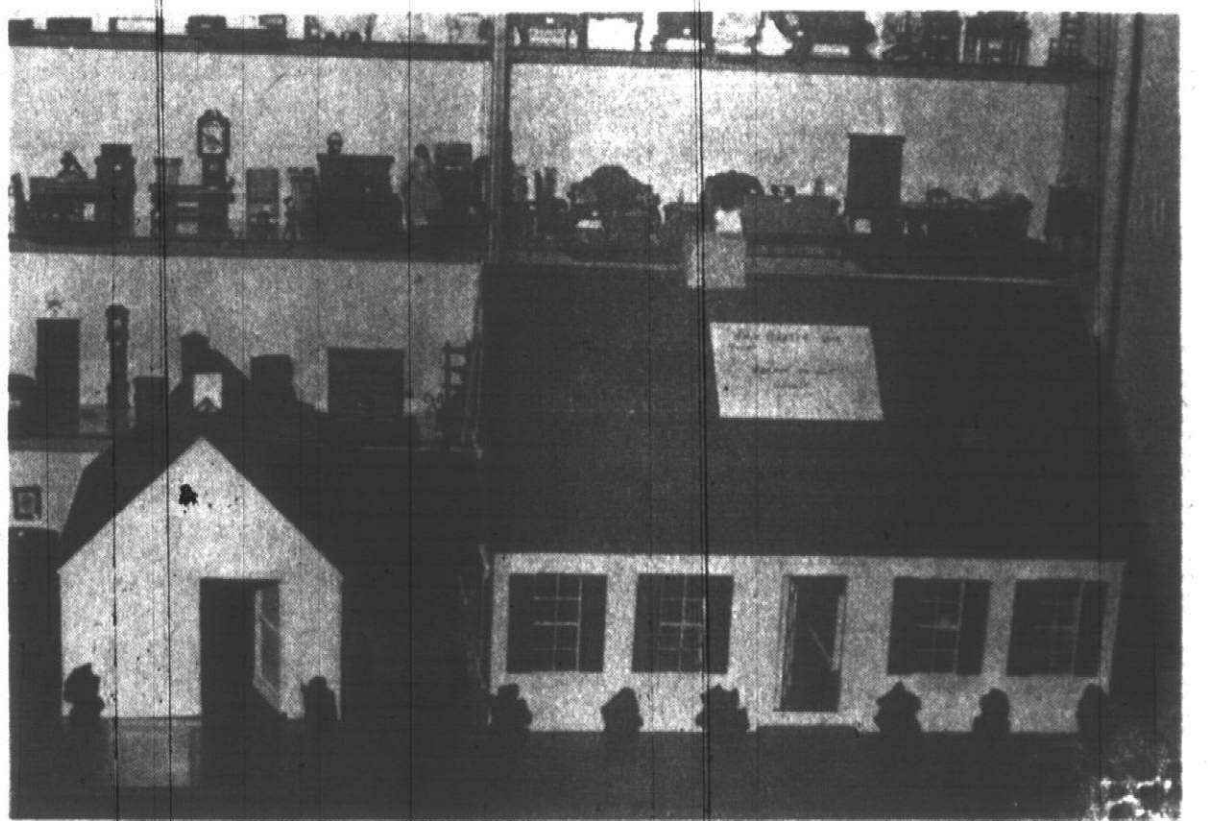
The doll house, with its breezeway and attached garage, was packed in a large carton. "It took two weeks to get here from Oglethorpe," said Muriel. "It changed trucks several times along the way."

The house is unfurnished, except for bathroom facilities which Mrs. Whitt carved from wood and painted white.

"It is not as sophisticated as some of our doll houses," said Mrs. Calhoun. "This is just the second one she made. But it's solidly constructed. It is to be played with, not put on a shelf and admired."

His See is one of five ancient thrones of Christendom, and he is spiritual leader of the second largest body

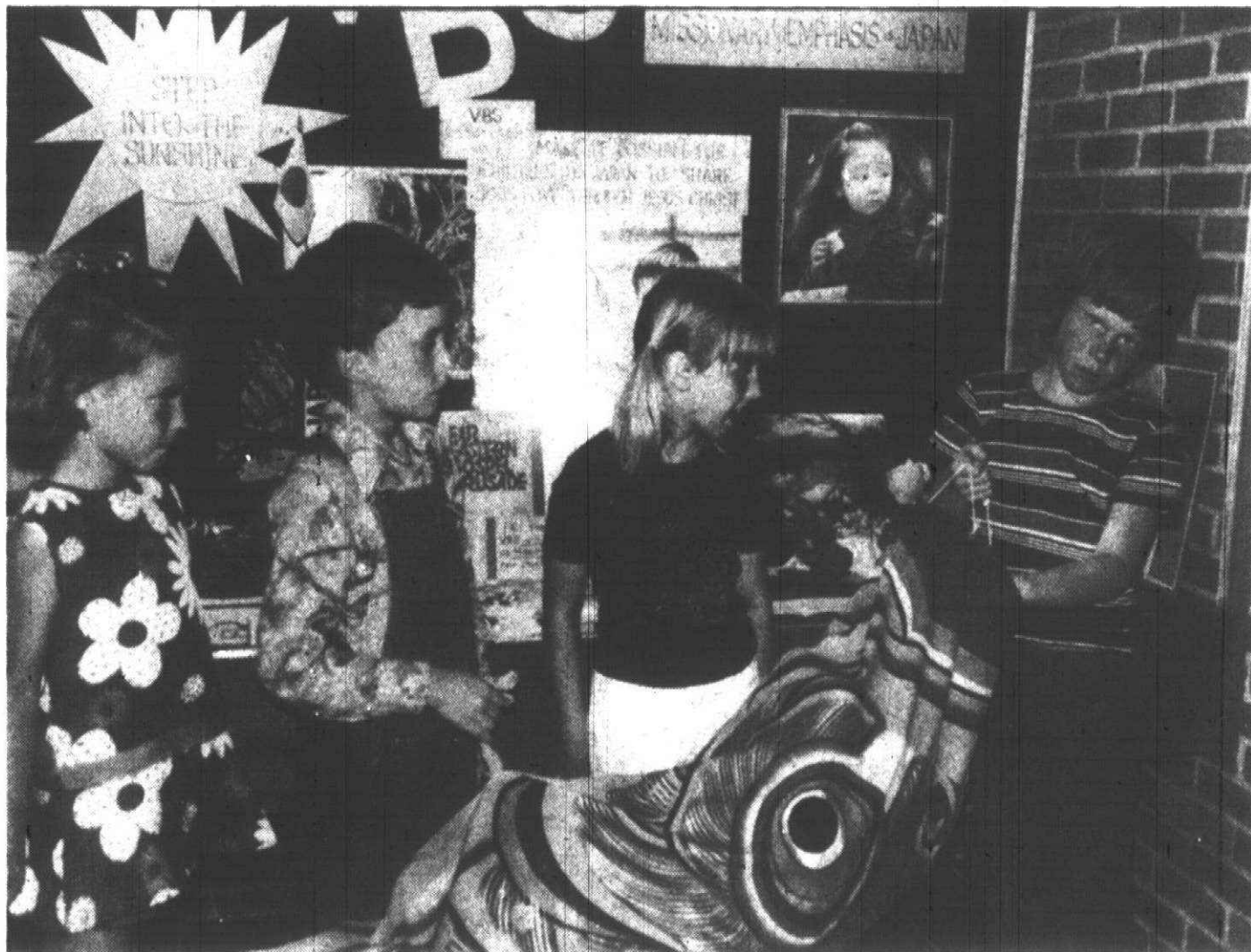
of Christians in the world, the 300-million Orthodox Catholics.

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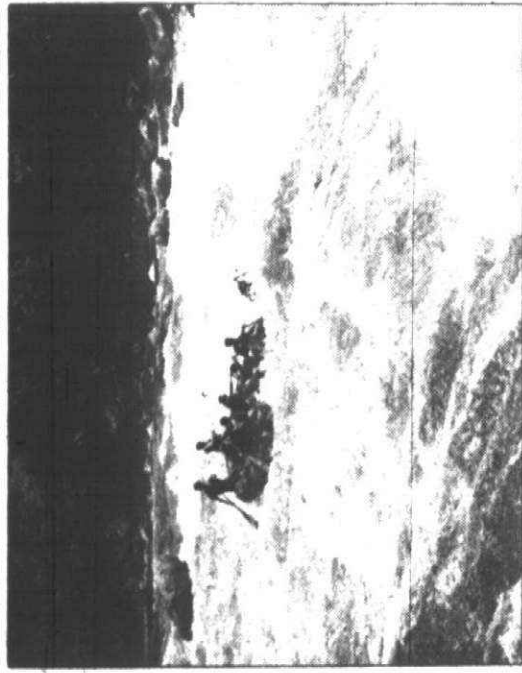
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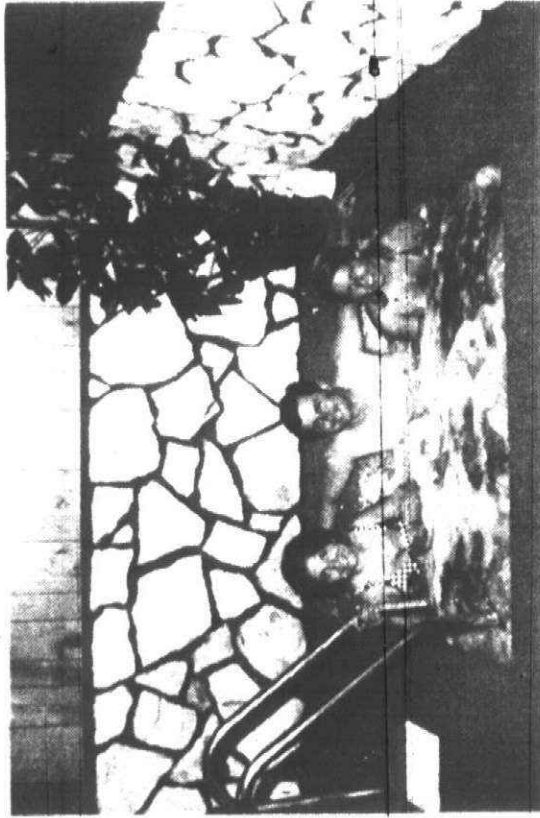
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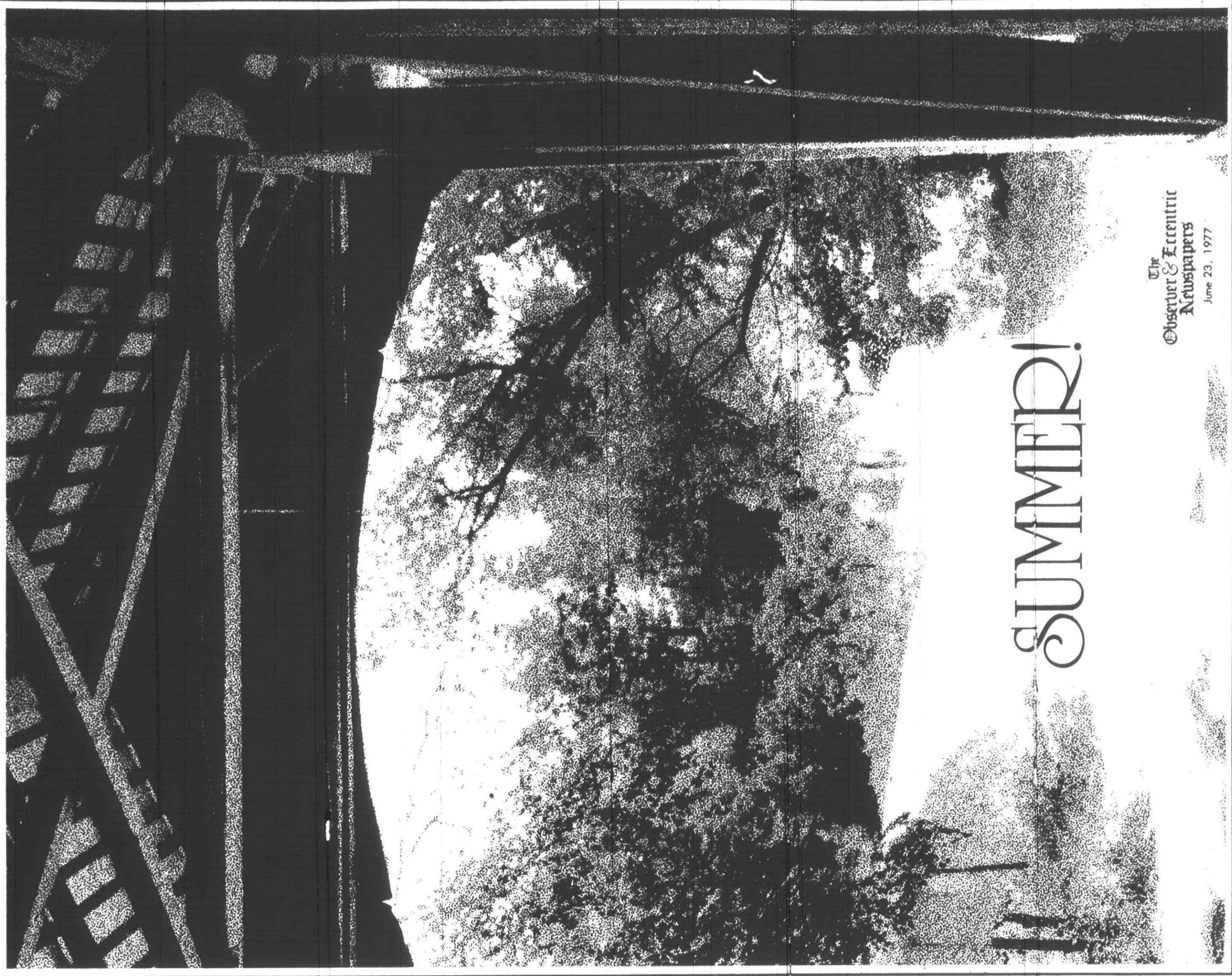

The way station turned out to be a National Forest Service rest area and information station. A lonely clerk offered me a map and asked if I needed any information. She was kinda cute so I said yes, although I thought I had enough literature.

A lucky move! The map was the forest service guide to the Ottawa National Forest, and it introduced me to dozens of possible camping sites, boat launches and beaches that aren't on the official Michigan highway map.

Lake Gogebic State Park is all right if you don't mind a campground with the population of a small city, if you really need electricity, if you must wash in a hot shower (after standing in line) and if you want to buy your campfire wood in a bundle instead of finding it yourself.

But we spent the rest of our trip in an Ottawa National Forest campground on a 400-acre lake with a nice beach and plenty of tree growth between campsites and clean two-holers. Even had a couple of visits from bears.

The moral of the story is that you need two maps of any given area in Michigan to find your way around. The state map doesn't list federal sites, and the federal map avoids any details about state sites.

The same thing happened recently when this confirmed inland laker decided to test the waters of Lake St. Clair. There's a book of slickly printed color maps called "Fishing Charts" published by the Lake St. Clair Advisory Committee. This \$3 gem tells you fishing hot spots, where to catch your favorite fish and in what months.

What it doesn't tell you is where to launch your boat. Not a single launch site is shown in the entire book. What I finally had to do was lay a map of Metropolitan Beach, in the Huron-Clint-

on Metroparks guide, alongside the fishing map and dope out where I could drop by boat.

Two maps it took. I don't care to promote commercial products usually, but a worthy exception is the big "Guide to Fun in Michigan," published by the Michigan United Conservation Clubs. You can pick it up in most bookstores and many sporting goods shops.

The MUCC book has maps of every single road and path that will carry a car in every out-state county of Michigan. Its drawback is that major arteries are poorly shown and the type is small. To find your way, you need to use the MUCC guide in conjunction with the state highway map.

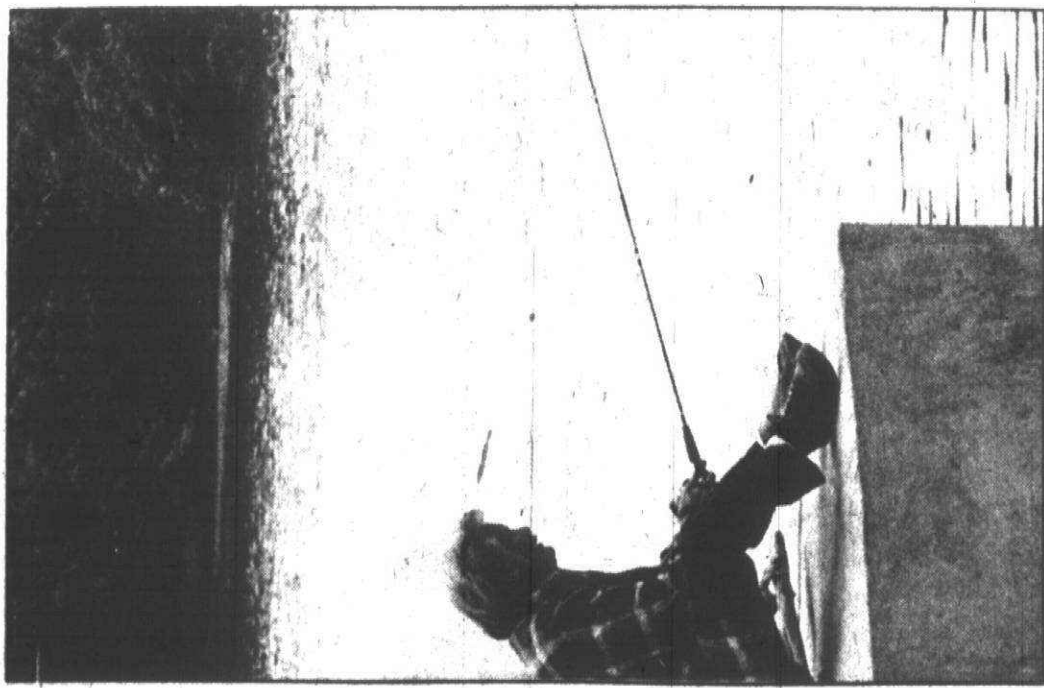
Another feature of the MUCC book is its chart, by counties, of every state and federal campground, revealing the number of campsites, whether it has electricity, a boat launch, a beach, picnicking and the rest. Again, use it in conjunction with your state and national forest maps.

A word about procuring those national forest maps: You can get them in advance by mail. If you're planning to camp.

- In the northeastern lower peninsula, write: Forest Supervisor, Huron National Forest, Cadillac, Mich.
- In the northwestern lower peninsula, write: Forest Supervisor, Manistee National Forest, Cadillac, Mich.
- In the eastern or central upper peninsula, write: Forest Supervisor, Hiawatha National Forest, Escanaba, Mich.
- In the western upper peninsula, write: Forest Supervisor, Ottawa National Forest, Escanaba, Mich.

I can hear some tourist and auto-promoting outfits saying, "Hey, don't forget the private campgrounds." Frankly, I would just as soon forget the private campgrounds except in an emergency when you can't get in someplace else.

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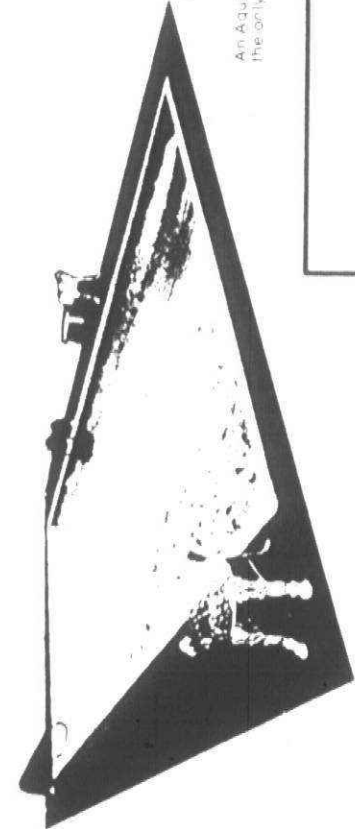
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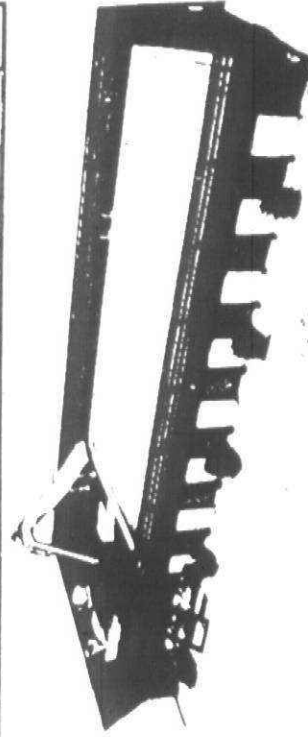
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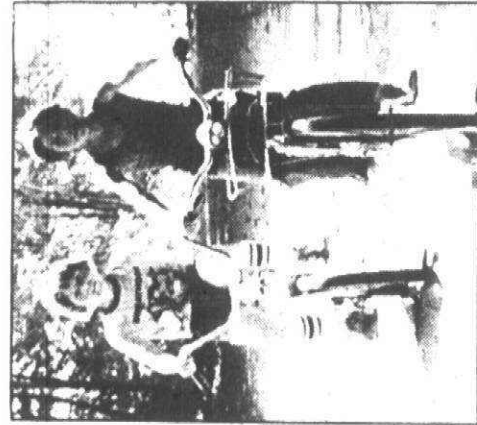

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# Climbing: One way to get away

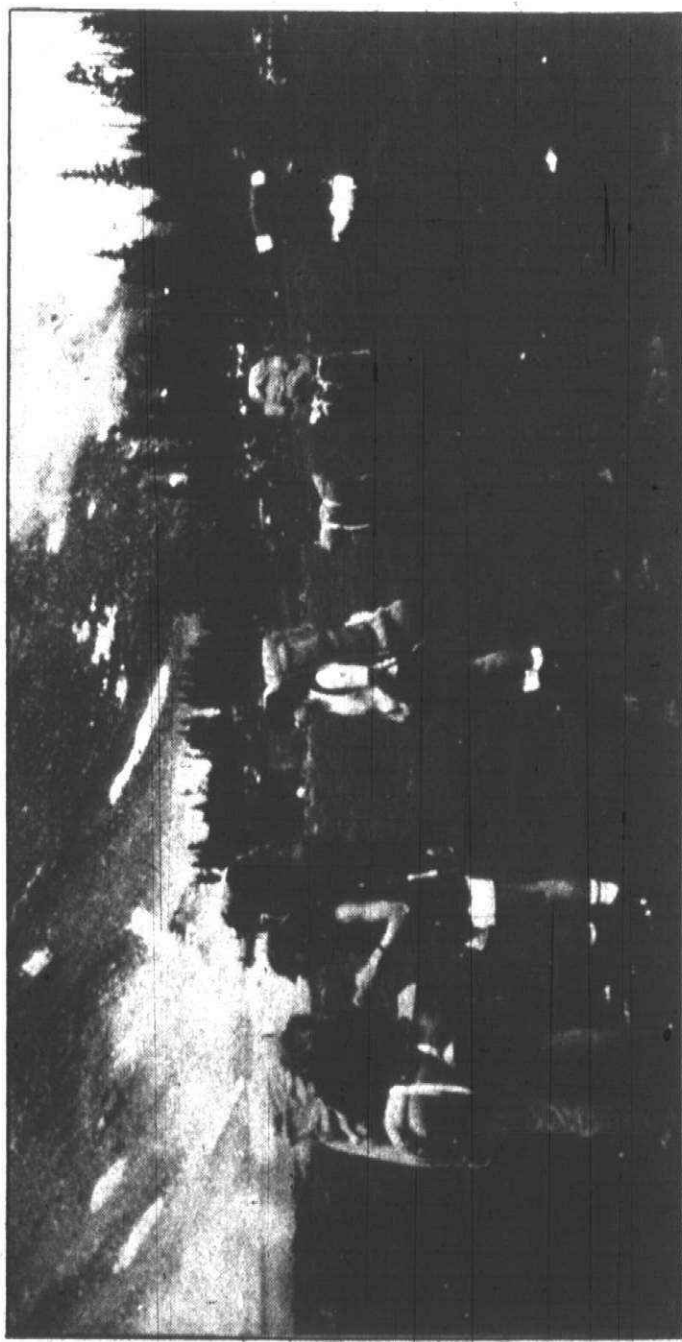
Wilderness adventure, mountain climbing—it conjures visions of the classic outdoors be-man.

# Choo choo cheer This train derails summer blahs

Children turn handstands, market ladies balance baskets of fruits on their heads and a calypso band plays as the Catadupa Choo-choo tools its winding way from Montego Bay into Jamaica's hill country.

Visitors to Jamaica who take this "special diesel train, known officially as the Governor's Coach but more affectionately as the Catadupa Choo-choo" to explore rural Jamaican life that is often missed by the more persistent sun-worshippers. The train runs 40 miles into the interior along side plantations, lush scenery and picturesque villages to the Appleton rum distillery. Parts of the route are inaccessible by road.

Just outside Montego Bay the coach passes banana and sugar cane estates before chugging into the hills. From Bogue Hill the city and its harbor spread out far below. The sun catches the rich greens, blues and lavenders of the Caribbean and glistening white cruise ships in port.

At the village of Anchovy, boys in khaki and girls in their navy jumpers play games in the schoolyard. Jamaica Redpole and Brahman cattle graze in tree-shaded pastures dotted with stands of tall, waving bamboo near the hamlet of Montpelier. In the citrus groves and in the barrows of local vendors are oranges, limes, oranges and grapefruit (an ortanique is a delicious cross between a grapefruit and an orange).

tween an orange and a tangerine.

At Cambridge, a market town, the train pulls onto a siding track to wait for the Kingston express to pass on the single-track rail to Montego Bay. And not surprisingly, here are vendors of straw baskets, hats, place-mats, beads, fruits and wood carvings.

The Catadupa Choo-choo takes its nickname from the tiny village of Catadupa. The railway stop is surrounded by a bewildering array of hundreds of brightly-colored and patterned fabrics hanging on lines in the sun.

After Catadupa, villages become less frequent. See Me No More Valley marks the beginning of the Cockpit Country. The land forms into strange little peaks or cockpits, the site of wars in the 18th century between the English and the Maroons, the runaway slaves who fought successfully to maintain independence in this commando-terrain.

The Governor's Coach leaves the Montego Bay railroad station at 9:30 a.m. and returns about 4:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday during the busy summer and winter seasons and on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and

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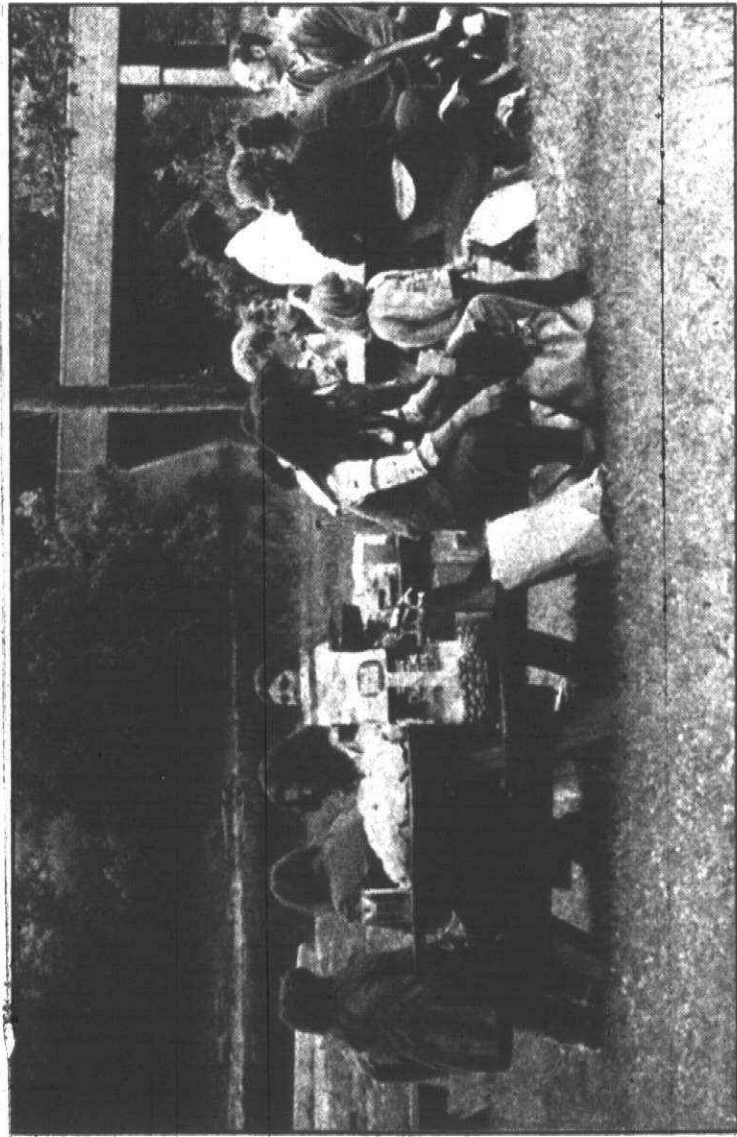
# Summer — time to relax your way

## Go straight to the Straits for sightseeing

For sightseeing and variety that offers just about something for everyone, the lower peninsula's Straits of Mackinac area has a combination of attractions almost unmatched.

The Mackinac Bridge, Fort Michilimackinac and its marine complex, Mackinac Island, camping at one of Michigan's most pristine wilderness parks, boating, two colorful pageants, good food, fudge—all are within a stretch less than 15 miles wide.

The Mackinac Bridge, since 1957 the impressive link between Michigan's two peninsulas, is one of the world's top engineering achievements.

The five-mile-long structure, the world's longest suspension bridge between cable anchorages, can be seen for miles from either peninsula on a clear day. Its main towers loom 552 feet above the water.

No trip to northern Michigan would be complete without a visit to historic Mackinac Island. 45 minutes away by ferryboat from either Mackinaw City or St. Ignace.

High shoreline cliffs add to the natural beauty panorama of the island which offers the visitor hours of sightseeing, including old churches and several choices of resort hotels topped by the famous Grand Hotel, the world's largest summer resort hotel.

The biggest attraction, Fort Mackinac, an 18th century military stronghold, watches over the island, and hours can be spent visiting the 14 original buildings which include three blockhouses.

Since automobiles are banned, travel around the three-mile-long island is by horse-drawn carriage, rented bicycles or on foot.

While the fort itself is the island's focal point, there is much history elsewhere. Old buildings include the Astor Warehouse, old Agency House of John Jacob Astor's American Fur Co., the Indian Dormitory, Benjamin Blacksmith Shop, Mission Church and the Biddle House, oldest residence on the island.

Just below the fort is Marquette Park, named for the Jesuit missionary who founded the St. Ignace mission in 1671 and helped

bring Christianity to the Great Lakes region. Mackinac Island's Lilac Festival, set this year for June 14-15, is one of Michigan's most colorful annual events.

At Mackinaw City, in the shadow of the Straits and at the tip of the lower peninsula, is restored Fort Michilimackinac, a French and British fortification which preceded Fort Mackinac.

The buildings of Fort Michilimackinac are surrounded by a high stockade, all on the original site as disclosed by field excavations which began in 1959 and are continuing.

The biggest event in the fort's history, its capture by Indians from the British, is commemorated each year with a pageant put on by local thespians. They reenact the 1763 incident during Chief Pontiac's conspiracy when Chippewa and Sauk Indians overcame the British garrison through a ruse.

The fort complex includes Maritime Park, with Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse a main attraction. The light-house, built in 1882 and discontinued when the Mackinac Bridge opened, has been turned into a maritime museum. Other exhibits in the complex include boats, anchors and other marine artifacts.

Twelve miles west of Mackinac City along the picturesque Straits of Mackinac is Wilderness State Park, one of the few lower peninsula parks which offer large areas virtually untouched by man.

The park's top highlights are its varied topography and equally varied vegetation. A park of great natural beauty, with dense evergreen forests and natural beaches, it affords opportunities to hike, explore and observe the unusual flow-ers, plant and animal life that abound. Some interior areas of Wilderness State Park are almost impenetrable.

Wilderness State Park has 6,925 acres, four campgrounds and a total of 210 campsites. The main campground is along the Straits where there are modern facilities, electricity, a disposal station for trailers, shade and ready access to the beach along the Straits.



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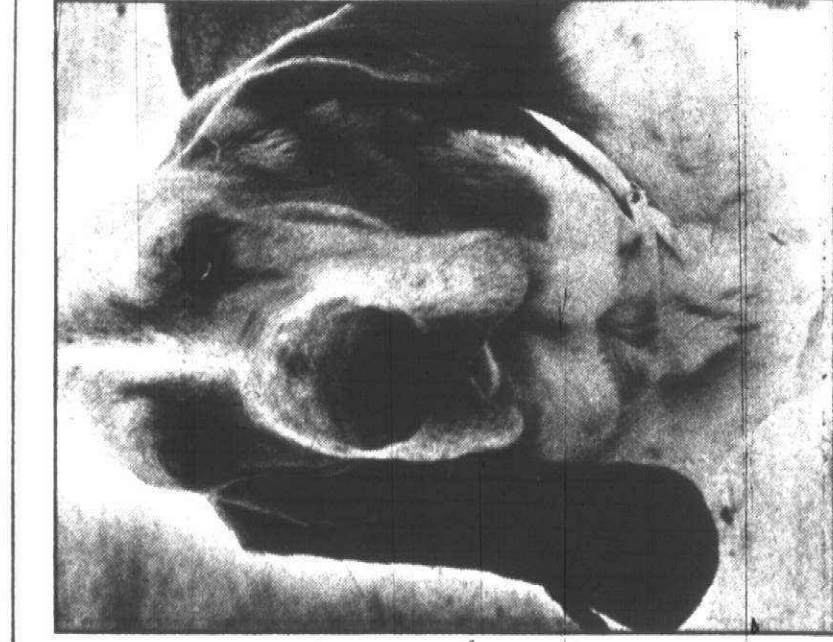
Traveling time for many Americans raises the question of what to do about the family dog.

"There is no reason not to take the family pet along to take the famend road trip. Furthermore, leaving the family pet behind in a kennel costs money, adding to the vacation expense. All it takes is a bit of planning," says Mrs. Pat Dittmann, public service representative of the Alpo Center for Advanced Pet Study.

"Each year thousands of dog show people travel all over the country with their dogs to compete in dog shows.

"A wire traveling crate with a secure snaplock is the most useful item a pet owner can buy when taking their pets on a motor trip. They can be purchased at any pet store, and the return in peace of mind, knowing the family pet is secure, more than offsets the cost.

"The traveling crate is more than security," Mrs. Dittmann says. "It becomes a home for your pet on the road. A water dish can be attached to the side of the crate, ice cubes put in it

while you travel, and the dog will have a cooling treat without spillage.

The crate makes a good place to bed the dog down at night as a guarantee to motel managers that the

motel's furnishings will be safe.

"Your dog is also 'crate safe' in your motel room when you are out. Protect both your pet and maid should she suddenly enter

the room. Dogs have been known to run away into a strange countryside when the maid has opened a motel room door.

"When you stop for lunch or dinner, the pet can be left in the crate with the car windows open for full ventilation, under a shady tree. Overheated cars and heat prostration are all too common. The cool of the morning becomes the heat of the afternoon, and the car heats up in a hurry."

Mrs. Dittmann suggests pet owners make lunch stops a snack break for their dog too. "Give him a good run, and allow him a treat before you put him back in the car. The exercise will allow him to stretch his muscles, and the treat will take the edge off his hunger until you arrive at your destination and give him his regular full meal."

She also cautions that pet should not have a full meal for at least one hour before traveling.

"Other equipment must include a water bowl and feeding dish. An unbreakable stainless steel bowl is light, easy to clean and store. However, if the pet's usual dish can travel, the familiarity of it will add to the pet's sense of security in unfamiliar surroundings.

A strong leash, a green leather buckle collar, with a securely fastened, complete identification tag, is also a necessary requirement. Dogs running at large in strange areas, no matter how well trained, oftentimes fail to respond to commands.

"Add a roll of paper towels to his bath towel and blanket list. A scoopier and plastic bags should also be included in the dog's travel kit to clean up after your

pet on motel or camp grounds.

Several weeks before you plan to travel, get your dog ready. A veterinary check-up is good insurance against sudden illness. Bring distemper booster shots and rabies shots up to date. Carry health vaccination certificates, signed by a veterinarian, with you for your own protection in case of an inadvertent dog bite.

If you plan to visit Canada, or Mexico, you will need these certificates to cross the border. Vaccination should be within 12 months and the certificate should state the vaccine used and also a description of the pet. If your pet is inclined to become ear sick, or extremely nervous, ask your veterinarian for medication.

Decide on your feeding schedule. Your veterinarian can recommend the best diet for the trip based on the dog's age and weight. Switch from the pet's regular at-home feeding schedule slowly. Give your pet at least two weeks to get accustomed to a new diet. Don't forget the can opener.

This done, you are almost ready to go. Plan ahead for reservations at motels and campgrounds; some accept pets and some do not. Several travel guides, including Mobil and AAA list motels and campsites which allow pets. They are published by region and list places of interest and restaurants, as well as housing, to make the trip more interesting.

Campers will find that the U.S. Dept. of Parks and state park services list park campsites which allow pets. Many no longer do. Be sure to check in advance.

If you have the time, but don't...

The time was when a house was really not a home if its foyer didn't boast a stately grandfather clock, with melodious chimes to sound the quarter-hours and a gong to toll the hours.

It has an eight-day movement that lets you choose the dramatic chimes of Westminster, Whittington or Winchester simply by moving a lever. The other clock is 75 inches tall, with a tempus fugit dial and Westminster chime.

Half the job is the right tools

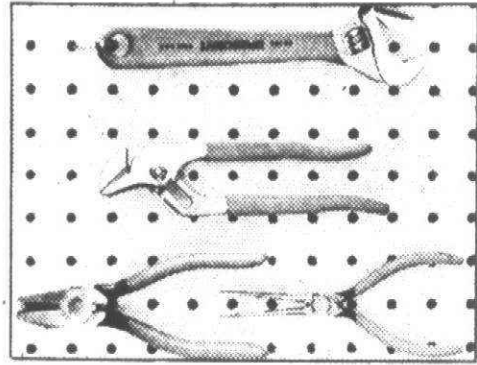
It is just as important to have good screwdrivers, pliers and soldering equipment at your workbench as it is to use durable, high quality construction materials for home improvement projects.

If you "cut corners" on either, the finished work will show it. Even worse, your sense of satisfaction that follows a job well done will suffer, and chances are there'll have to be a re-do in the not-too-distant future.

Here are some guides to the selection of some basic hand tools:

•Hand tools are designed to make a job easier and enable the homeowner-handymen to work well, efficiently and safely. Knowing your tools and how to use them and care for them will help—libraries have good handbooks on the subject.

•Hand tools must be comfortable to use—balance, weight, size and handles are factors to consider. For example, many crescent pliers, and wrenches are made with cushion grip, a red fiber-impregnated handle surface that insures a positive and safe hold to prevent slips and skinned knuckles. Screwdrivers have oversize handles for better and easier grip and turning power. Some hand-saws have comfort-engineered wood grips; some soldering guns feature a compact balanced pistol grip, and certain measuring tapes are compact and easy to hold, some even



having position-lock blades to permit one-hand use.

•Look for precision-machined tools with component parts that are perfectly mated to each other. Materials and finishes are important, too—drop forged alloy or carbon steels, chrome plating for resistance to humid or corrosive atmospheres, modern and durable plastics, U.L. wiring tags, firm and positive action of interchangeable tips—these are some of the signs of quality not always present in the ordinary "garden variety" of tools.

Once you have outfitted your home workshop, organize it in any manner that suits you. But do organize! It just slows an improvement or repair project if you have to stop and search for each tool you need. Jobs will be easier and better done too if you keep your tools in good condition, and use each tool only for the purpose it was designed to perform.

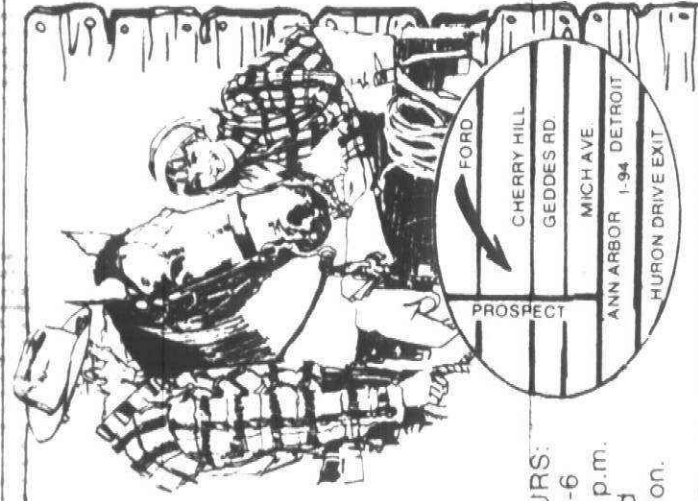
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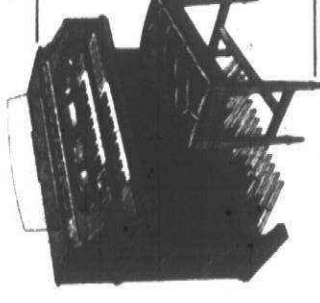
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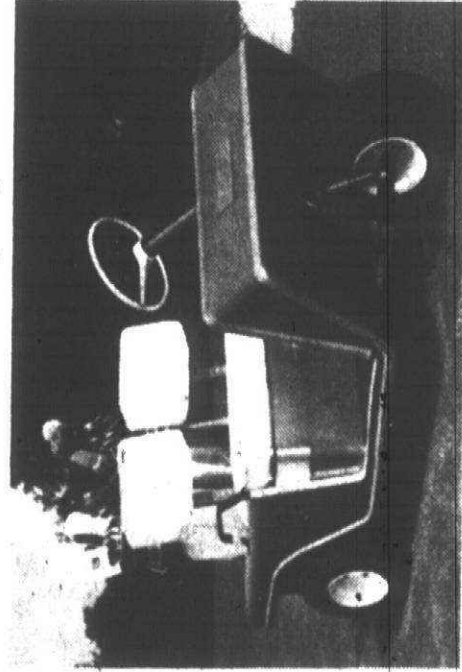
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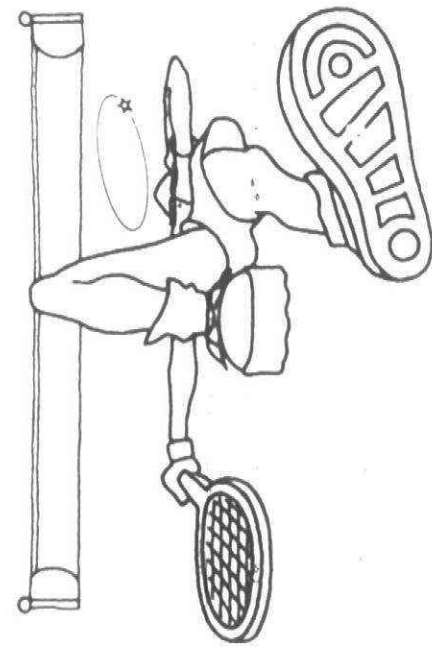
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## Knockout

Fun in the sun  
can leave you cold

Here comes the sun, and with it pain and severe illness for many outdoor sports enthusiasts.

With the arrival of warm weather, hordes of unprepared athletes will again risk their lives because they aren't aware of the dangers of heat, according to Dr. Jack End, medical director of the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Co. of Milwaukee.

The symptoms of heat problems are breathing difficulty, headache, dizziness, and a burning sensation in chest and legs.

A person affected can help himself by stopping the activity which is generating the body heat and getting out of the sun, the doctor says.

Some of the conditions which can occur are: Heat exhaustion which results when a person doesn't drink enough fluids for the type of activity he is engaged in. If it isn't recognized and treated it can quickly lead to sunstroke, a critical condition.

Heat cramps, which are painful muscle spasms that occur after strenuous exercise, even by people in good physical condition. They are accompanied by pale, clammy skin and normal to sub-normal body temperatures.

The most serious heat condition problem, sunstroke (or heatstroke), has the added symptoms of high body temperature, skin that is red, hot and dry, and pounding pulse.

End warns that direct exposure to the sun is not nec-

essary for sunstroke to occur—high humidity and excessive activity can also be important factors.

"When a person has sunstroke symptoms, forget about giving him liquids through the mouth," End said. "Cool him off using any liquid available and keep him wet, rub his skin to open surface blood vessels and get him to a doctor quickly."

End pointed out that even champions in top shape feel the effects of heat. Special training can help people adjust, but at extremes of heat and humidity the fit and unfit are affected alike. The doctor also gave this word of warning:

"Don't believe what your old high school coaches said about becoming accustomed to heat by refusing water. When you're thirsty your body is telling you something. Stop what you're doing and take a drink."

He pointed out that coaches now encourage athletes to drink small amounts of liquids frequently during practices and games.

"If you feel you can't avoid strenuous sports during extremely hot weather because of prior reservations or to keep a habit pattern established, dress lightly, drink plenty of fluids and don't push yourself quite as hard," he adds. He recommends early morning and late afternoon or evening as the best times for warm weather workouts.

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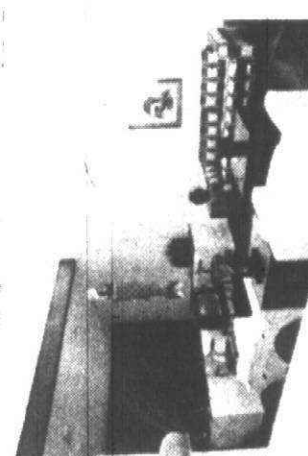
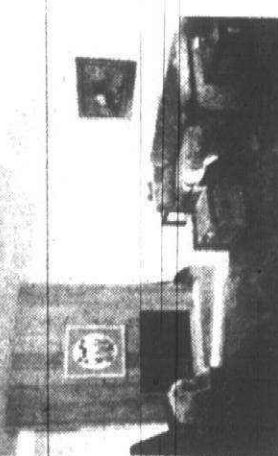
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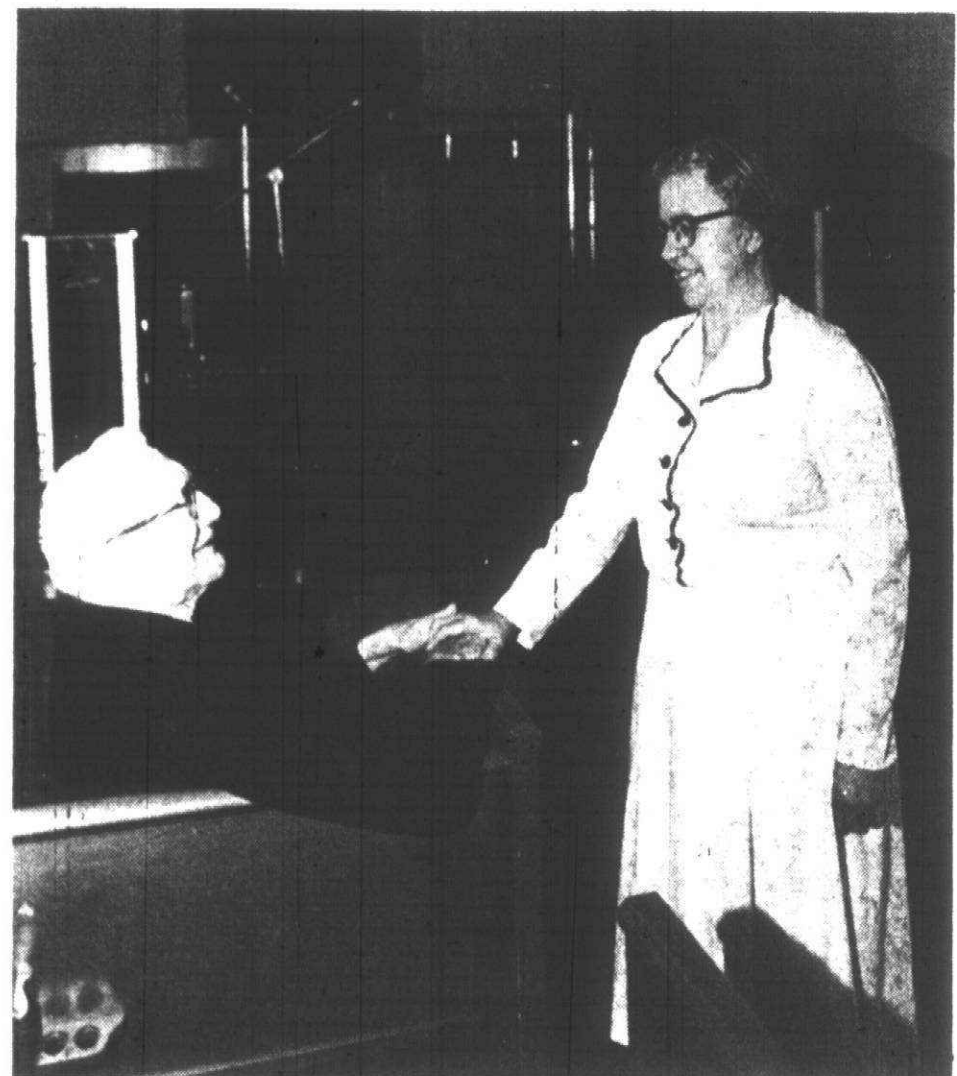
# Pilgrim's Mission church marks 25th anniversary

A church that has outgrown three meeting places and is led by one of the oldest pastors in this area is entering its second quarter-century after a weekend of 25th anniversary services.

The congregation of Garden City Pilgrim's Mission Church, at 5737 Middle Belt, paid special tribute to the Rev. B.H. Lucas and his wife, Ethel, its leaders for the past 25 years, in special events which continued Thursday through Sunday.

The Lucas' invited two guest preachers, the Rev. J.M. Sullivan, MD, and the Rev. Billy Watts of Seymour, Ind., to share in the Sunday worship and anniversary ceremonies.

The Rev. Lucas, now 88, came with his wife to Garden City early in 1952.

They had been traveling evangelists in the eastern part of the United States for a number of years, and, at the time of their settling here, the Rev. Lucas had been a pastor in the Pilgrim's church for 35 years.

The beginnings of Pilgrim's Mission were in services held in the home of the late Harold Nichols. Five families attended regularly at first.

In June 1952, the young congregation rented a hall on Merriman east of Ford Road. Soon crowds were jamming the small hall, so the church moved its services to a building at 3350 Ford Road.

That building too was small, but the people of Pilgrim's Mission soon proceeded to triple its size with an addition in 1955. The church paid off its mortgage in June 1956, and dedicated the building the next month.

The congregation continued to grow and the space again became too small. Nine years ago there was another move, this time to the present quarters on Middle Belt.

Since moving, six Sunday school rooms have been added in the church basement and the main sanctuary has been carpeted and paneled.

A parsonage for the Rev. and Mrs. Lucas was purchased in 1970, and church and parsonage were dedicated in June 1972.

The congregation now has a full-time assistant pastor, the Rev. William Beagan, who works with Rev. and Mrs. Lucas in directing activities of the local church and overseeing a strong mission program.

Currently, Pilgrim's Mission supports a missionary in Taiwan and two native workers, one in South America and one in Haiti.

Looking back on 25 years, Rev. Lucas told his congregation:

"We can say with Samuel of old that 'Hitherto hath the Lord helped us.' We all give praise to God and the end is not yet."

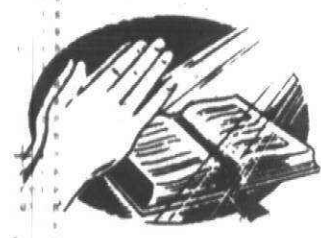

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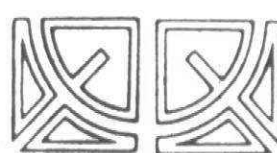

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# Massey of Plymouth slides to softball title

Don Massey Cadillac of Plymouth won five straight games without a defeat to easily win the third-annual Plymouth-Canton men's slow-pitch softball tournament last weekend, as expected.

Massey came from behind in the championship game to defeat Finlan Insurance, 18-14, to cop the title. Massey earlier demolished Finlan, the second-place finisher, 22-6 in the final game of the winner's bracket.

It marked the first time that a Plymouth squad has won this tournament as Massey, last year's defending city champions, was in control all the way.

McMurray Insurance, famed as the comeback winner of this tourney last two years, saw its efforts fall short this time around as it had to settle for third place after Finlan knocked them out with a 6-4 victory.

Finlan finishes as the tourney's runner-up for the second season in a row. McMurray can now only look forward to winning its sixth straight Canton league title.

GEORGE SMITH Realty of Canton and Kurl 'N' Kut Hut of Plymouth proved to be the surprise teams of the tourney with fourth- and fifth-place finishes respectively.

Massey of Canton also earned respect, tying Kurl for fifth place. Mas-

sey upended McMurray in an exciting first-round contest, 8-7 in eight innings. Friday night which sent the defending champions scraping for all they could get.

H.A.F. Industries and Garden City Sporting Goods were the two disappointments in the tourney as both were upset in the first round by lowly teams from Bathey and Bayloff.

The tournament, under the direction of Plymouth Parks and Recreation Director Chuck Skene, was held under a double-elimination format for all 19 teams.

A late rain on Friday night cancelled a lot of games scheduled for Saturday, but the contests were made up with early morning starts on Sunday.

The champions from Massey and the runners-up from Finlan each received sponsor and individual trophies.

Massey shortstop Tom Battistone received an additional trophy as the tournament's Most Valuable Player. Battistone played outstanding defense from his tough position throughout the action and finished with an electrifying .750 batting average, 12 hits in 16 trips to the plate. He also knocked home the tying run of the championship game as part of Massey's strong comeback.

IN THE FINALE, Massey held a slim 5-4 first inning lead but Finlan scored three times in the second and four more in the third to grab an 11-5 margin.

Massey came roaring back in the fourth inning with four runs that cut the Finlan advantage to 11-8.

A big seven-run fifth inning turned the trick as Massey was never behind after that.

In that productive stanza, all 10 batters reached the plate for the winners. With one out, Tim Abramski started the rally with a double.

Louie Bryant knocked Abramski home with a double and, he scored the second run on a single by Cal Glomski.

Glomski moved to third on a single by Dennis Kesik and both crossed the plate when Brian Gilles doubled.

After two were out, Gilles came home with the fifth run on a single by Battistone. The Massey shortstop scored on a single by Pete Woodard, who crossed the plate on that same play thanks to an error by the Finlan leftfielder.

Finlan, coached by Conrad Valade, saw its championship game attack led by Frank Strumbells, Mike Borders and Mike Lindman with three hits each.

Borders and Woodard each hit home runs in the contest.

McMURRAY'S DEFEAT to Finlan was a heartbreaker. The defending champions were behind by two runs in the last inning but had the bases loaded with two outs and failed to produce.

George Smith ousted Massey of Canton, 17-15, for fourth place with a 17-15 victory which included 24 walks combined. Smith later lost to McMurray, 8-3.

Kurl 'N' Kut Hut had its best chances against both McMurray and Massey but choked away two upset victories. Kurl was ahead of Massey 3-0 in the sixth inning but lost 10-3, and had McMurray on the ropes 2-0 going into the seventh before falling 3-2.

Both Massey squads clashed in a second-round game Saturday afternoon, and it was no contest as Dave Broad limited Massey of Canton to only five hits in the champion's easy 8-1 victory.

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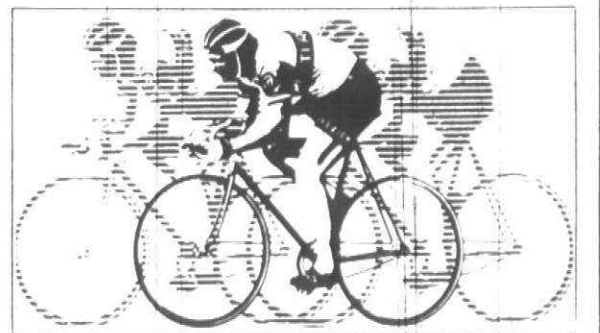
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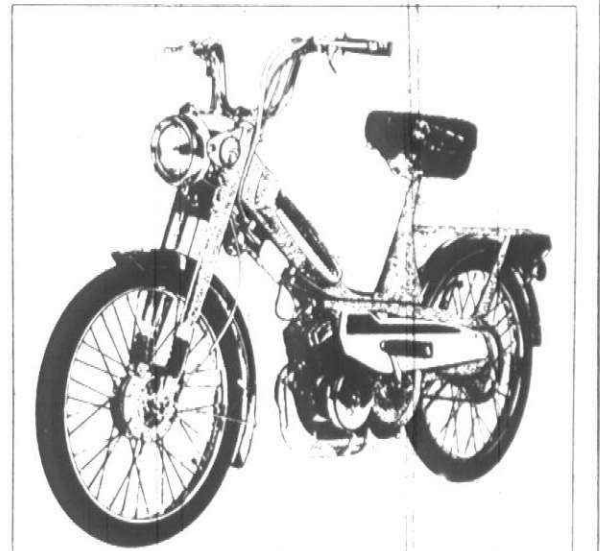
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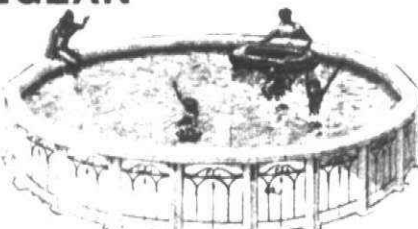
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# Review

## 'I do! I do!'— alive and well-done

A professional performance of a Broadway musical at Farmington and Plymouth roads? Why not?

Vittorio's, in Sheldon Center in Livonia, is the first to give western Wayne County a dinner theater choice of entertainment. And it's a marvelous choice.

R and G Productions picked a tried and true musical, "I Do, I Do," hired two experienced professionals, and Vittorio's rearranged the dining room to generously accommodate a stage and space for a dinner theater and audience.

Edgar A. Guest III, director, gets the most out of the combination and incorporates the aptly nostalgic musical into an innovative theater-in-the-round performance.

"I Do! I Do!" is a lyrical rendition of "The Four Poster," about an old-fashioned couple growing old.

Nancy Gurwin and Phil Marcus Esser command your attention in the opening scene and never lose it. They sing their first vows together, not front and center stage, but in an attention-getting, well-timed number on a well-lit platform at the back of the room. They vow to stay "Together Forever" and stride down the aisle to the stage with both newlywed and first-of-show radiance.

It's an old story; there are no new twists. It's what you expect in a song-and-dance chronology, starting from the blush of the honeymoon bed, through the labor pains of expectancy, the first gray, middle-aged flirtation with another's freedom, right through to the sweet and sour day the kids get married.

IN TODAY'S WORLD, some do, many don't. But in this story, boy meets girl and they stay together forever. It's no bed of roses, even with a mother-in-law's embroidered pillow on the bed. And it's far from the modern bash of the pad of the single swinger.

In its refreshing and unique way, the story is suggestive—suggestive of the loveable and painful in a shared experience of keeping the very old show on the road in changing times. It's made special, as such stories go, by the first-rate voices and acting abilities of Gurwin and Esser.

From the opening vows to the closing song of recollection in the last number, "This House," it's a story of discovery. Part of the charm is that Agnes and Michael discover each other and, in the end, rediscover their lives together.

It's not a flash of discovery, but a light-hearted catalogue of the bumps and grinds of rougher times and the champagne celebrations of the good.

They remind you that love isn't everything, but it keeps things fun. The storyline sounds familiar and it is. Though it has been around for some time, the quality of this performance is far better than the standard replay of "remember when things were different?"

EVERY DETAIL of the musical performance is good. The piano, string and percussion accompaniment is professionally incorporated and adaptable to the beat, mood and tempo Gurwin and Esser command on stage.

Vittorio's presents not only a dinner theater in the round, but also an evening's entertainment in the round. After the performance, the sliding

doors at the back of the dining area are opened, and an up-beat band, Galaxy, provides music and sets the stage for the dance floor.

One would wish the transition from the softness of the show's closing song to the dance floor were a little smoother; perhaps they could invite the audience to dance with a few bars from the musical.

Dinner and performances are scheduled for Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings. Dinner is served at 7 p.m. and the show begins at 8:30.

The press review didn't include dinner, so we can't comment on the cuisine. The menu includes steamship round of beef, chicken caeciatore and baked salmon or halibut.

## 'Annie Hall'

## Woody's best; Keaton never finer

"Annie Hall" (PG) is Woody Allen's best film yet. Written and directed by Allen, with a storyline that somewhat parallels his own life, it is both a comic and bittersweet sounding of contemporary life and love.

Woody plays Alvy Singer, a twice-divorced, very New York, gag writer who has become a comedian. In the opening scene, he addresses the audience directly in a monologue. Summing up his philosophy of life in two key jokes, he leads into the sad-funny story of the true love of his life, Annie Hall.

As Annie, Diane Keaton, looking fresher and prettier than ever, for once has an opportunity to show some of her own range as an actress. Until now, she has been effective but restricted in scope in her roles opposite Woody. When sweet Annie from the boondocks and intellectual Alvy from the Big Apple fall in love, you know there will be some changes made.

Alvy suffers from a "New York, Jewish, liberal, intellectual" syndrome. He seems obsessively concerned with these qualities in himself and others. When he flies to Wisconsin to meet Annie's rural, Midwest, Protestant family, he faces a cultural gap of Grand Canyon proportions.

NEVERTHELESS, the romance of Alvy and Annie continues because physical relationships can be beautiful too. They make love, and Alvy says he never had so much fun without laughing.

He seems to imply that we should "go" with our senses, not trust reason; yet, he puts down this notion too. He stops a young couple on the street, walking close together, and asks them the secret of their happiness. The secret is that they are both very dumb, dull people.

"Annie Hall" is a movie that jumps with technical bravado—split screen, surrealist effects, subtitles; but, they are more than mere gimmicks because each one is used to effectively make a point.

Tony Roberts, Carol Kane, Paul Simon, Shelley Duvall and many others excellently perform small but essential roles that contribute to the feeling and momentum of the film.

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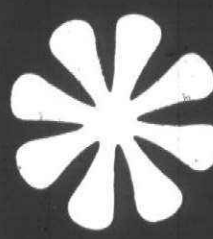
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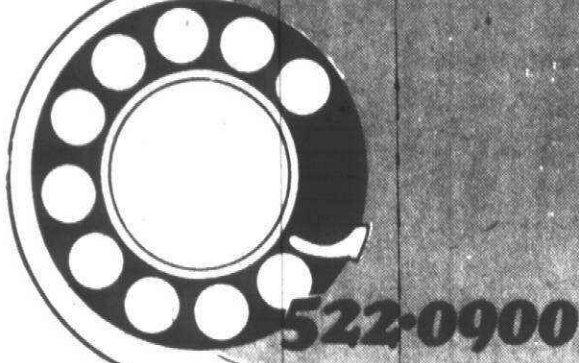
