## Stein, Bradley, Daley await word on recall

After some 11th-hour scurrying, signed petitions calling for the recall of Supervisor Harold Stein and two elected members of his political slate were presented to Wayne County Deputy Clerk Orville Tungate on Friday.

A total of 1,280 signatures were on Stein recall petitions submitted to the county at 10 a.m. by Peter Lamar Gabbert, leader of the first recall movement which seeks Stein's ouster.

He was accompanied by Linda LaBell, leader of the second recall movement which seeks the removal of Treasurer Anne Bradley and Trustee Gene Daley. But only the Bradley recall petitions, bearing 1,530 signatures, were submitted in the morning visit. The Daley recall petitions were not available at that time because they were still being checked against voter rolls by Canton Clerk John Flodin's staff.

In the middle of the afternoon Mrs. LaBell picked up the batch of finished Daley recall petitions and made another trip to Detroit's City-County Building. There were 1,525 names on the Daley recall forms.

ONLY 1,251 valid signatures are needed to force a recall election against any Canton board member. The county clerk's office has 15 days to check the petitions. If at least 1,251 valid signatures against any one elected official are found, a recall election must be scheduled within 60 days.

Mrs. LaBell hurried along her later petition drive to avoid the possibility of having one election to decide Stein's fate and another to decide the outcome of Bradley and Daley. She vowed to submit her petitions on the same day that Gabbert turned his in. Gabbert held off submitting his petitions until the end of the 90-day dead-

line to accommodate the second recall group.

Charges against the three officials are similar. All three are accused of encouraging, rather than discouraging, new home construction in the growing township. It is claimed that the three officials take a soft stand in enforcing quality construction practices. And all three are rapped for their opposition to the 1976 Master Land Use Plan which would reserve most of the western half of the township for strictly agricultural use.

Stein and Daley are criticized for their opposition to establishing a full-time Canton Police Department. Daley, in particular, is cited for a conflict of interest on police matters because of his daytime employment with the Wayne County Sheriff Department.

DALEY SAID the township board has never voted to expend money to

fund the sheriff's department. In rebuttal to a charge criticizing the lack of a Canton police chief, Daley points out that nine men have been interviewed for the job and one will be hired soon. Expansion of the police force should be put to a public vote, Stein and Daley say.

Stein and Bradley deny the allegation that they are "pro-growth," saying they are for "orderly development throughout the township" that recognizes the legal rights of landowners. Stein mentions the fact that he reintroduced a motion that prohibits any new platting of subdivision lots until a zoning ordinance is passed to accompany a master land use plan. Stein believes growth will be regulated automatically because of the lack of existing sewer capacity.

All three candidates call the recall a political power play instigated by the two candidates who lost the super-

visor's race in last November's three-way contest—Republican Peter Bundarin, and Robert Greenstein, former supervisor, who waged a second-place write-in bid after losing to Stein in the Democratic primary.

Stein said the recall is a "parlor game" for many residents working on the drive.

But Peter Gabbert says the people of Canton don't have to be persuaded by disgruntled politicians to start a recall drive.

"The man is incompetent," Gabbert said of Stein.

Regardless of the success or failure of the recall, Gabbert said he will push for the equivalent of a city manager to run the township, "and make the supervisor job a part-time post."

"This is no longer a one-horse town," Gabbert said. "We need professional people with municipal management skills."

## Colombian bundle arrives...

A Canton Township couple wanted a baby so bad they waded through 10 months of rigmarole and ended up in Bogota, Colombia where they adopted a brown-eyed baby girl born on Easter Sunday with a full head of unruly hair.

The Wright family returned home to their Spanish-style ranch home at 44063 Yorkshire, Canton June 16, after spending 17 days in the South American capital city.

Gayle, 24 and Doug, 26, are one of approximately 1,000 couples who will come from the United States and northern Europe this year to adopt an abandoned, orphaned or "surrendered" Colombian child.

The international adoptions are a controversial issue—a sailed by left-wing opponents of the Colombian government as a money-making baby business. But to Gayle, who tickles the tiny foot of 2½-month-old Tiffany Nicole, the adoption agency in Bogota was far from the snakepit she expected.

"It really was a neat place," she said Friday in her living room. "not like you'd imagine. I had a mental picture of the orphanage as one giant room with a bunch of kids lying around in beds with one person watching over them."

"THERE WERE about five babies in each room, with employees in every one of them. I had figured that

they'd just prop a bottle up next to the babies to feed them. But the nurses and employees would pick the babies up in their arms and feed them and hug on them. The toddlers were taken outside regularly to get some exercise and fresh air."

The adoption agency is known as FANA, which stands for the foundation for the adoption of abandoned children (ninos) in Spanish. The head of the agency is Ximena Lleras de Gutierrez, the daughter of Colombia's former president, Alberto Lleras.

They were put in touch with FANA through an Ann Arbor-based referral agency known as Colombian-American Friends. They first made contact with the referral agency on Aug. 25 after learning that there was a five year waiting list to adopt a normal, white American baby.

When the Wrights discussed the possibility of adopting a foreign child—possibly a Korean orphan—they sounded out their friends, neighbors and relatives to find out if the child would be accepted.

"My father fought in the Korean War, so I asked him how he'd feel if I adopted a Korean baby," said Mrs. Wright. "He said he'd feel like a grandfather. And I thought that was a perfect response."

But when Mrs. Wright saw a Colombian baby adopted by her mother's neighbor's niece, she and her husband decided to apply for a Colombian adoption.

That's when they contacted the liaison service in Ann Arbor to help unra-

vel the paperwork ahead of them—such as immigration visas, Colombian passport, fingerprint identifications, and a court hearing in Colombia with the judge, the prospective parents and the child.

DOUG WRIGHT works as an instrument technician for Ford Motor Co. and was able to take off work for three weeks to finalize the adoption process and pick up his new daughter.

In Colombia they met with a social worker named Emmy Allison who helped allay the fears of the young couple who landed in a strange country to make a momentous decision. The woman had lived in Colombia for seven years and acted as interpreter and emissary.

They met their baby within hours of landing at the airport and were able to take her back to the guest house where they were housed until final papers were approved.

The next day they went to the Colombian court with the infant for an adoption hearing. In about a week's time they received the baby's Colombian passport; a couple days later they received an American visa and two days after that the visa was signed by the proper authorities. Before it was all over the Wrights had spent close to \$4,000, including air fare.

But the day before the final authorization came, Mrs. Wright noticed Tiffany Nicole was acting uncharacteristically cranky.

The infant was suffering from dehydration caused by an intestinal parasite. Ten days later she was released

from the hospital and on her way to Canton Township, Michigan.

"WHEN YOU ADOPT a child you wonder, 'When will I know I really love this child as my own?' because you haven't carried the child for nine months," said Mrs. Wright.

"But when they said, 'That baby should be in a hospital,' it almost killed me. I thought I'd rather it be me who was sick instead of the baby. I just bawled and cried my eyes out worrying. That's when I knew I loved her."

The baby made excellent progress in the hospital and, since arriving in Canton, she has gained 10 ounces in six days.

"She's eating good for us," said Mrs. Wright. "She only cries when she's hungry. And that's a bonus-and-a-half."

Mrs. Wright said she and her husband returned from the country of Colombia with mixed emotions. Most of the people she came in contact with were very friendly toward Americans. In fact Rosalynn Carter came to Bogota while they were there and received a very warm welcome.

But the Wrights couldn't get used to seeing men with machine guns guarding the private schools of the upper class contrasted with the families living in a cardboard hut on a vacant lot in the city. "I have to use the old cliché. 'It's a nice place to visit but I wouldn't want to live there,'" said Mrs. Wright.

## Court is convened inside pickup truck

If you thought you saw the district judge hotrodding around town in a four-wheel pickup truck Wednesday, you were absolutely right.

Dunbar Davis, 35th District Court judge, was making a concerted effort to squeal the truck's tires by lurching and popping the clutch all over the City of Plymouth. Passengers inside the vehicle were a Canton patrolman and a young man who owns the truck.

And all the while this ride was going on, court was in session.

Explanation? It seems that Canton Ptl. Kurt Johnston ticketed David Johanningsmeier of 46985 Territorial, Plymouth, for "unnecessary noise" on June 5. The officer testified the defendant laid down a patch of rubber when he made a quick left into Canton's Harvard Square shopping center.

Johanningsmeier defended himself saying that he has been having problems with his truck "bogging down" on him after a stop. Not wanting to stall out in the middle of the turn, he gave the truck a little more gas than normal. Johanningsmeier argued that the resulting squeal was unintentional.

There is only way to settle the dispute, said the unorthodox judge.

He instructed the defendant to hand over his truck keys and all three persons left the courtroom and hopped into the pickup.

The judge overcame initial difficulty in discerning which knob was for the shift and which engaged all four wheels. Once that was settled, the judge sped off.

"Dunbar did a pretty good job taking off from the lights," said Johnston. "It struck me as kind of funny driving around Plymouth with a judge who is trying to squeal his tires. But it was a good way to settle the matter."

Even though the judge tried, he could not lay a patch.

Back on the bench, Judge Davis announced: "Son, you're guilty. I couldn't get those tires to squeal."

After Johanningsmeier paid a \$35 fine and \$5 court costs he picked up his truck in the judge's private parking space. He said he was relieved it didn't have a ticket on the windshield.

## ...Gignacs adopt icebox raiders

Jim and Nancy Gignac are back in their Plymouth Township home, the proud, new parents of two boys, one 5 and one 6 years old.

That's right 5 and 6. The Gignacs returned last week from Bogota, Colombia, where they joined a growing number of Americans in adopting South American children.

"I'll say one thing about these kids," laughed Jim, who is vacationing from his regular duties as chief of Plymouth Township Fire Department. "they don't judge you by the size of your billfold but by how much you have in your icebox."

Since the natural brothers have been in this country, he said, they have been putting away an average of two gallons of milk a day.

"Having access to a refrigerator is, of course, very new to Tony and Daniel," added Nancy. "In the orphanage, it was unheard of."

Although Anthony and Daniel were chosen by the Gignacs as the boys' first names, they were both allowed to have middle names of their own choosing.

"THESE KIDS HAVE a heritage, and there is no point in trying to hide it from them or anyone else, but we wanted to give them American names," Jim said.

Tony chose Enrique as his middle name, and Danny liked Luis.

Both kids speak passable English, the Gignacs said, and they will enter school this year. In addition to regular classes, they will receive tutoring in language.

"I don't think we'll run into any problems," said Nancy thoughtfully, "but if we do, I hope we can make the boys understand that some people judge others by how they look instead of by what they are."

"But it doesn't matter to us. We're going to love these kids as if they were our very own."

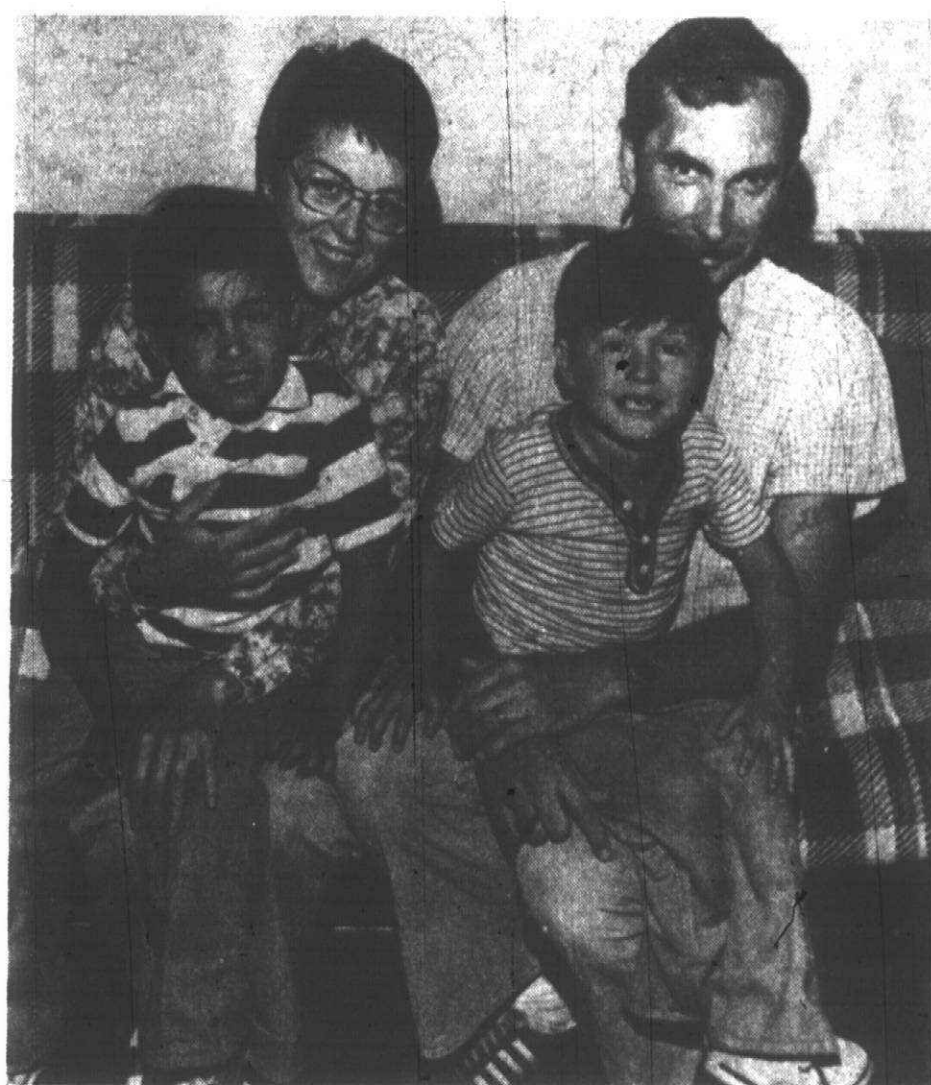
In discussing the nine-month saga of the adoption process, the Gignacs' conversation is laden with words like "official," "governments," "agency," and "home-study interviews."

They made the decision to adopt in October of last year and then started to make inquiries.

"We were just amazed," said Jim. "We went to every agency in Wayne County and were told they wouldn't even take our names for 18 months to six years."

Not content with the answer, they next checked out adoption agencies in Wexford and Midland counties, but were informed they were not eligible.

## 5 local officials go on D.C. trip

Five members of the Canton Township government and three spouses returned from Washington, D.C. Saturday where they reportedly went to learn the inside track on how government grants are granted.

Air fare, lodging and up to \$20 a day personal expenses for Supervisor Harold Stein, Trustees Lynne Goldsmith and Brian Schwall and Treasurer Anne Bradley will come out of the township's general fund. Deputy Treasurer Mike Gorman, who prepares federal grant proposals, will also be reimbursed for trip expenses.

Spouses of the officials had to pay their own way.

Clerk John Flodin, and Trustees Gene Daley and Robert Myers stayed home to mind the store.

Myers had signed up to attend the conference which is sponsored annually by U.S. Rep. William D. Ford (D-Taylor). But at the last minute, he said, his father-in-law had a stroke which forced his cancellation.

Officials at the conference attend

seminars and listen to speakers talk about the latest developments in federal agencies and recent changes in federal rules, regulations and grants.

A PAMPHLET SENT out by Ford's office on the conference lists the air fare as \$88 for adults. Rooms are \$40 for a double and \$34 for a single room. There is a conference registration fee of \$35 per person.

"To be honest, if I went I would have partied down," said Trustee Myers.

"If you want to get anything accomplished you have to hustle outside the spectrum of the conference."

"I would have checked on the progress of the sound barriers to be installed along I-275 and I probably would have met with some friends of mine in the LEAA (Law Enforcement Assistance Act) to try to find more funding for our local police department."

"But I also would have sailed on the Potomac, gone to Mount Vernon, and maybe see the panda bears at the zoo. I'd still say it's a good expense of township money if the elected official

knows what he's doing and knows what he or she wants to accomplish before he gets there."

Myers said the conference can amount to nothing more than "cock-tails and dull speeches" if the politicians aren't careful.

Canton was one of 17 communities in Ford's district that were represented at the conference.

ALTHOUGH PLYMOUTH TOWNSHIP is in his district, Supervisor Thomas Notebaert said nobody went "because we weren't invited."

"I know that Helen Richardson (township clerk) was invited about six years ago," he said. "But she couldn't make it for one reason or another and we've never gotten a repeat."

Canton Clerk Flodin, who attended the conference last year and wanted to stay home with his wife this year, defended the high cost of sending five Canton officials to the conference.

"We think it's worthwhile," Flodin said. "There's an awful lot to be learned down there. And they are kept pretty busy."

# Xway construction disturbs 100-year-old grave on M-14

The discovery of two overturned tombstones at the highway construction site of M-14 over Sheldon Road in Plymouth Township has resulted in direct orders from the State of Michigan for workers there not to disturb the grave site.

The tombstones, bearing the names of Erasmus and Nancy Shearer, were found by highway department survey crews earlier this year, according to Doug Kelley, supervisor for the M&B contracting company.

The state highway department gave Plymouth Township Supervisor Thomas Notebeart its assurances that the tombstones will remain in their places untouched. The state will return the tombstones to their original upright position, in addition to beautifying the site as part of its reclamation work of the area, Notebeart said.

Both tombstones are made of concrete and were apparently chipped by bulldozers, Kelley said. "It's fortunate

the tombstones weren't damaged any worse than they are. When we cleared this area, no one knew of their existence."

The tombstone of Erasmus Shearer gives Aug. 26, 1877 as his date of death. Shearer died at the age of 78. His wife died on Nov. 5, 1862; she was 62.

THE TOMBSTONES are located in the area which used to be the Shearer farm in the mid-1800s. Notebeart said.

The land was later developed into a subdivision of 76 lots. Called the Supervisor's Plymouth Plat No. 6, the subdivision, with its 50 homeowners, was completely wiped out last year to make way for the M-14 highway.

Notebeart said there are no known relatives of the Shearers living in or around Plymouth Township. If relatives

are located, they can demand that the state restore and beautify the grave site, Kelley said.

"People are very finicky about disturbing grave sites. When they say final resting place, that's what they mean—final. I know of highways that have been rerouted around grave sites," Kelley said.

Construction workers have already gone out of their way to preserve the site. The tombstones are set only 12 feet away from the proposed freeway. Kelley said under normal conditions, the tombstones would have been covered with topsoil pushed aside from the path of the freeway.

It's not uncommon for construction workers to come across grave sites, according to Kelley. Workers have searched the area for additional gravesites but have found none.

## Keep your beliefs and that job

A recent U.S. Supreme Court ruling denying employees the right to take time off work for religious reasons may give some employers a lever they don't plan on using.

In a random survey of businesses in the Plymouth-Canton area, the majority of owners and managers polled felt the question of release time was one which could be worked out on an individual basis.

A number of those in the religious community, however, expressed concern about what they called growing civil intrusion into the domain of religious freedom.

The ruling came as a result of a law suit filed by a Trans World Airline clerk who was fired for refusing to work on Friday evenings and Saturdays saying his religion forbade it.

"As long as the request didn't interfere with the operation of the business, we would try to respect our em-

ployee's beliefs," said Bernadine Randolph, manager of the Clock Restaurant in Plymouth Township.

"We do have a couple people who have become super religious, but that's only been within the last six months. And so far we've been able to manage."

According to Ed Matson, staff at the Plymouth Hilton Hotel are prepared for the odd hours of the hospitality industry.

"I don't think the ruling will cause us problems. Employees are hired with the understanding that they will be available for work at any and all times."

"But as part of our general practice, we try to grant requests for time off if it is at all possible."

Brian Michmerhuizen, manager of Meijer Thrifty Acres, also said the new ruling would not have an immediate impact on the Canton store.

"Our work policies were established

long before the court decision. We post our work schedules a week in advance. Special requests for exceptions are honored if we have enough notice."

"An employee could request time off for religious reasons, or to go to a prom, or anything else for that matter."

**CLERGY FROM AREA** churches were almost unanimous in the feeling that the state had over-stepped its boundaries in rendering the judgment. Rev. Jeff Goldsmith, of Canton's Geneva United Presbyterian Church was the only dissenting voice.

"Let's just say I can buy the the judges' thinking. It reinforces the distinction between church and state. Churches should compete in a free society. If we can't hold our own, then maybe we should close up shop."

Rev. John Crosslin of the Church of Christ in Plymouth saw the decision as another indication of a growing tide against religion.

"That kind of legal opinion certainly destroys religious freedom. How can a man practice his religion with the government telling him what to do?"

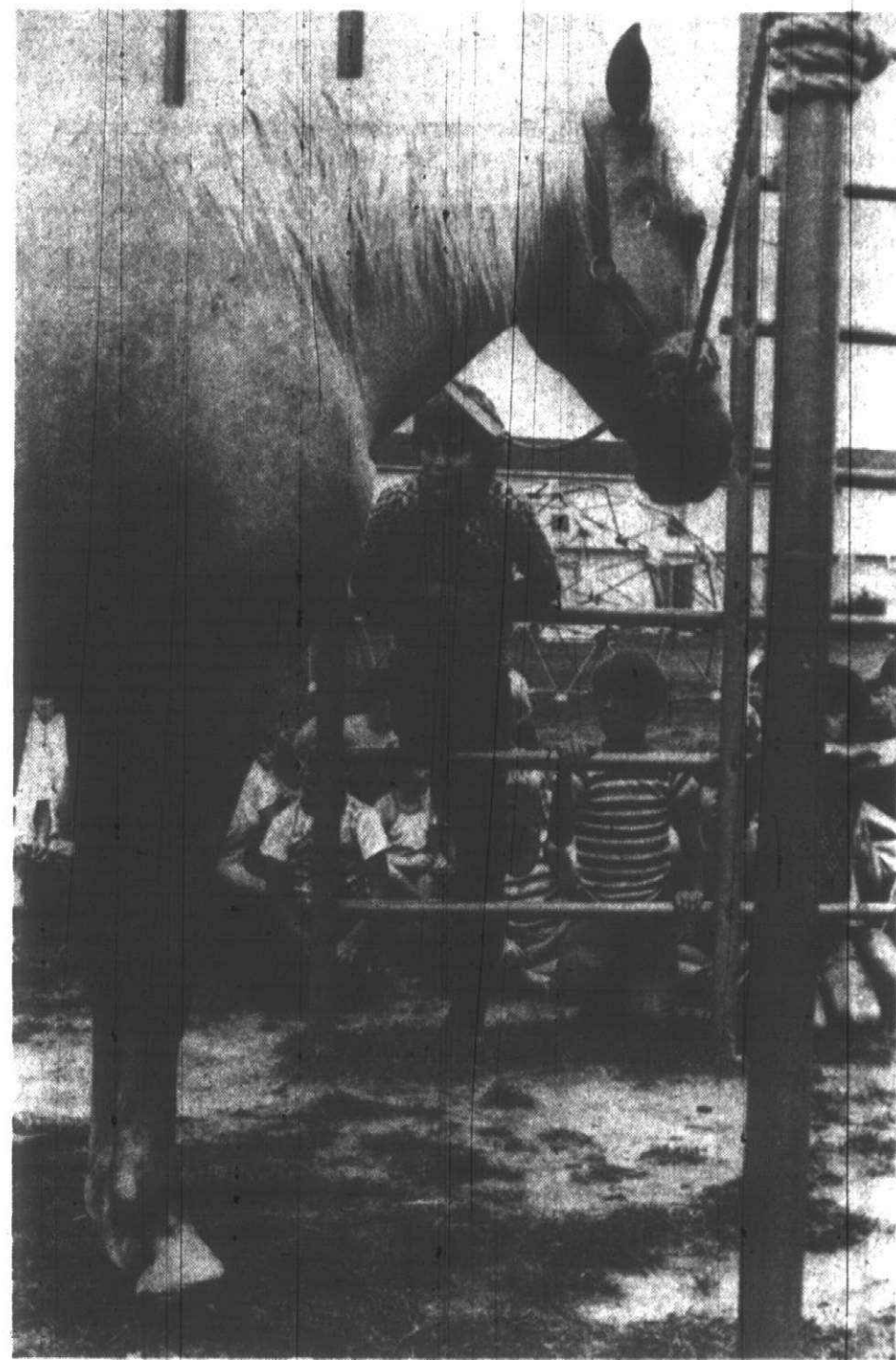
"If we let them destroy this, they can get away with destroying everything else too."

Carson Coonce of the Jehovah's Witnesses on Sheldon Road was not pleased with the ruling, but he felt the final question was between the individual and his or her conscience.

"We try our level best to stay away from conflicts we can avoid. We learned a long time ago that the government's interests are not ours, and we're not going to change it."

"But each person has a conscience, and in any specific situation, he or she would have to answer to that."

Because the Jehovah's Witnesses observe special days of worship, Coonce felt the ruling would have a definite impact on the members.

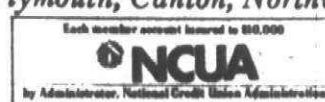

"There's no retaliation here," Licata continued. "We aren't interested in any single issue, such as high-rises. We have been in existence since 1971 and never have been a single-issue group."

Licata added that, from his standpoint, the Federation this year also placed high priority on experience and knowledge of government. "Moehle is an incumbent commissioner with experience. Fechter is an administrator for Schoolcraft College with management expertise. Weh-meyer holds a similar management position with Ford Motor as Turner does, and Ms. Watt has political experience with groups like the League of Women Voters and has attended commission meetings regularly.

"It was a tough decision, though. That's why it took 14 ballots."

THOMAN, another who was endorsed two years ago, reacted strongly when he heard of the choices.

"I think the choices are very biased. In my opinion, they picked the worse possible ones. That's based on my observations of the Federation interviews, because I was there from start to finish. Based on the answers I heard given, if the Federation picked those four it must have had its mind made up before the interviews started.

"I can understand the endorsement of Moehle. But except for Moehle, the others don't have the slightest idea what's going on in this city.

"There was a good slate of candidates the Federation could have picked from. Except for Moehle, they probably picked the worst of the lot. That's saying nothing against any candidate as an individual. They are all very sincere people. I'm just saying it's obvious, to me at least, that some just don't have as much knowledge of the city as others."

When the Wrights discussed the possibility of adopting a foreign child—possibly a Korean orphan—they sounded out their friends, neighbors and relatives to find out if the child would be accepted.

"My father fought in the Korean War, so I asked him how he'd feel if I adopted a Korean baby," said Mrs. Wright. "He said he'd feel like a grandfather. And I thought that was a perfect response."

But when Mrs. Wright saw a Colombian baby adopted by her mother's neighbor's niece, she and her husband decided to apply for a Colombian adoption.

That's when they contacted the liaison service in Ann Arbor to help unravel the paperwork ahead of them—such as immigration visas, Colombian passport, fingerprint identifications, and a court hearing in Colombia with the judge, the prospective parents and the child.

DOUG WRIGHT works as an instrument technician for Ford Motor Co. and was able to take off work for three weeks to finalize the adoption process and pick up his new daughter.

In Colombia they met with a social worker named Emmy Allison who helped allay the fears of the young couple who landed in a strange country to make a momentous decision. The woman had lived in Colombia for seven years and acted as interpreter and emissary.

They met their baby within hours of landing at the airport and were able to take her back to the guest house where they were housed until final papers were approved.

The next day they went to the Colombian court with the infant for an adoption hearing. In about a week's time they received the baby's Colombian passport; a couple days later they received an American visa and two days after that the visa was signed.

## Court is convened inside pickup truck

If you thought you saw the district judge hotrodding around town in a four-wheel pickup truck Wednesday, you were absolutely right.

Dunbar Davis, 35th District Court judge, was making a concerted effort to squeal the truck's tires by lurching and popping the clutch all over the City of Plymouth. Passengers inside the vehicle were a Canton patrolman and a young man who owns the truck.

And all the while this ride was going on, court was in session.

Explanation? It seems that Canton Ptl. Kurt Johnston ticketed David Johanningsmeier of 46985 Territorial, Plymouth, for "unnecessary noise" on June 5. The officer testified the defendant laid down a patch of rubber when he made a quick left into Canton's Harvard Square shopping center.

Johanningsmeier defended himself saying that he has been having problems with his truck "bogging down" on him after a stop. Not wanting to stall out in the middle of the turn, he gave the truck a little more gas than normal. Johanningsmeier argued that

ed by the proper authorities. Before it was all over the Wrights had spent close to \$4,000, including air fare.

But the day before the final authorization came, Mrs. Wright noticed Tiffany Nicole was acting uncharacteristically cranky.

The infant was suffering from dehydration caused by an intestinal parasite. Ten days later she was released from the hospital and on her way to Canton Township, Michigan.

"WHEN YOU ADOPT a child you wonder, 'When will I know I really love this child as my own?' because you haven't carried the child for nine months," said Mrs. Wright.

"But when they said, 'That baby should be in a hospital,' it almost killed me. I thought I'd rather it be me who was sick instead of the baby. I just bawled and cried my eyes out worrying. That's when I knew I loved her."

The baby made excellent progress in the hospital and, since arriving in Canton, she has gained 10 ounces in six days.

"She's eating good, for us," said

Mrs. Wright. "She only cries when she's hungry. And that's a bonus-and-a-half."

Mrs. Wright said she and her husband returned from the country of Colombia with mixed emotions. Most of the people she came in contact with were very friendly toward Americans. In fact Rosalynn Carter came to Bogata while they were there and received a very warm welcome.

But the Wrights couldn't get used to seeing men with machine guns guarding the private schools of the upper class contrasted with the families living in a cardboard hut on a vacant lot in the city. "I have to use the old cliché. It's a nice place to visit but I wouldn't want to live there," said Mrs. Wright.

In spite of the governmental hassles, the Wrights are so happy about being parents they have already discussed possibly adopting another Colombian child. But it'll be a while, said Mrs. Wright, as she balanced a baby in one arm and cradled the phone receiver in the other.

## Students brainstorm for pill-poppers

With deteriorating eyesight, many elderly persons have trouble reading the small print on labels for medications. Those with arthritis often have difficulty getting the bottles open.

And many elderly people taking multiple medications find it hard to differentiate one medicine from another and to determine frequency and correct dosage.

These are some of the problems a University of Michigan industrial design class set out to solve.

Eighteen students in Prof. Allen Samuels' undergraduate class at the

U-M School of Art came up with different solutions to the problems, ranging from magnifiers which enlarge the print on standard medication dispensers to a container which can hold as many as eight different medications in separate compartments.

"One of our major design problems," according to Samuels, "was to create dispensers that could be manipulated easily by the elderly, but at the same time be clever enough that a child could not open the container."

Samuels goes on to note that for many elderly taking multiple medications, "keeping track of the separate containers is extremely difficult. Thus, many of the students' projects focused on ways to centralize storage of the medication."

One student produced a medicine "book" which dispenses a predetermined number of capsules on each page. Another device contains cups filled with prescribed medications which can be released by sliding the cups off a plastic track.

Probably the most marketable project in the class, according to Samuels, is a plastic magnifier which slides on and fastens to standard medicine bottles of various sizes.

As part of the course, the U-M students were coated lenses and other devices to simulate sensory impairments of the aged. The students' designs were critiqued by two members of the Institute of Gerontology at U-M: Leon Pastalan, director of research, and Mike Reiter, a pharmacist.

"The course has two basic goals," said Samuels. "One is to teach students how to design products, and the other is to enhance their sensitivity to people unlike themselves—in this case the elderly."

"The population in this country is turning upside down, with more and more elderly persons," says Samuels. "Companies have traditionally designed products for the majority. In addition, designs which serve the elderly could serve others as well."

# Schoolcraft hikes tuition

In-district Schoolcraft College students will pay \$2.50 more for each credit hour beginning this fall. The Schoolcraft Board of Trustees approved the increase June 22.

While the in-district tuition rate is being raised from its present level of \$13 per credit, rates for out-of-district and out-of-state students will stay the same. Out-of-district students will still pay \$26 per credit; out-of-state students will pay \$39.

Schoolcraft President c. Nelson Grote said the college would realize \$289,000 in additional revenue.

Another option presented for board action would have raised in-district tuition to \$15 and would have held other tuition levels constant. That plan, it was estimated, would have resulted in only \$231,500 in additional revenue.

AT AN EARLIER study session, the administration had raised the possibility of hiking tuition levels across

the board. Under that plan, in-district students would have paid \$15, out-of-district students would have paid \$28 per credit and out-of-state students would have been charged \$40 per credit.

That plan would have brought in \$294,000 in new revenue.

Grote said he decided, and the board concurred, that raising out-of-district and out-of-state rates would put Schoolcraft in a non-competitive position.

"Take a student living in southwestern Wayne County. He's deciding between Eastern Michigan University and Schoolcraft College. He can go to Eastern for a lower tuition rate," he said. Eastern Michigan's resident rate stands at \$24.50 per credit. Schoolcraft's present out-of-district rate is already higher than that charged by Eastern Michigan.

Grote also cited a similar example using Oakland University in Rochester. Oakland's tuition rate stands at

\$24.25 and would be well below the \$28 Schoolcraft had considered charging.

EVEN THOUGH ADDITIONAL revenue will be brought in, the college will operate on a "continuation budget," Grote said. The proposed property tax increase, which was defeated June 13, would have meant approximately \$375,000 in additional funds, he said.

Had the millage increase been approved, Schoolcraft would have been able to retain its tuition levels, reinstate major maintenance programs and restore services which had been slashed in austerity moves, Grote said.

"There will be no new programs. We will still have to keep the library closed on weekends and curtail weekend activities," Grote said.

"It still means we're about \$100,000 short of the kind of revenue we feel we need to operate the college the way we would like," Grote said.

GROTE ADDED that the revenue

generated by the tuition increase would allow the college to fill most of the vacancies which have gone unfilled recently. He said there were many vacancies in the secretarial area and maintenance departments.

Trustee Mark McQuesten said, "Students could have avoided the increase. If they would have gotten out and supported their school, we may have made it. Some got out and really busted their backs, and, well, some didn't."

"The board really doesn't have any choice," he said.

In voting to raise tuition for only in-district students, the board broke with past policy of raising rates on a 1-2-3 ratio. That policy had resulted in tuition rates of \$13 a credit for district residents, \$26 for out-of-district Michigan students and \$39 for out-of-state students.

In additional fees-related action, the board decided not to raise the student services fee.

## Job office report

Since opening last February, the Job Placement Office at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park has found employment for some 99 young persons.

That is among the information submitted in a status report to Plymouth-Canton Board of Education by Joyce Willis, director of the placement office at CEP.

Since opening in February, the office has accepted 370 applications from students, graduates or drop-outs and found jobs for 27 per cent.

The office contacted 750 employers, either through mailings, direct contacts, or phone calls. With those contacts, some 140 job openings were identified in the Plymouth-Canton area, meaning the bureau filled 71 per cent of the local jobs available with students who applied with the placement service.

Mrs. Willis notes that of the 99 placements, some students have obtained more than one position through the Job Placement Office, some have since terminated, but most remain employed to the best of her knowledge.

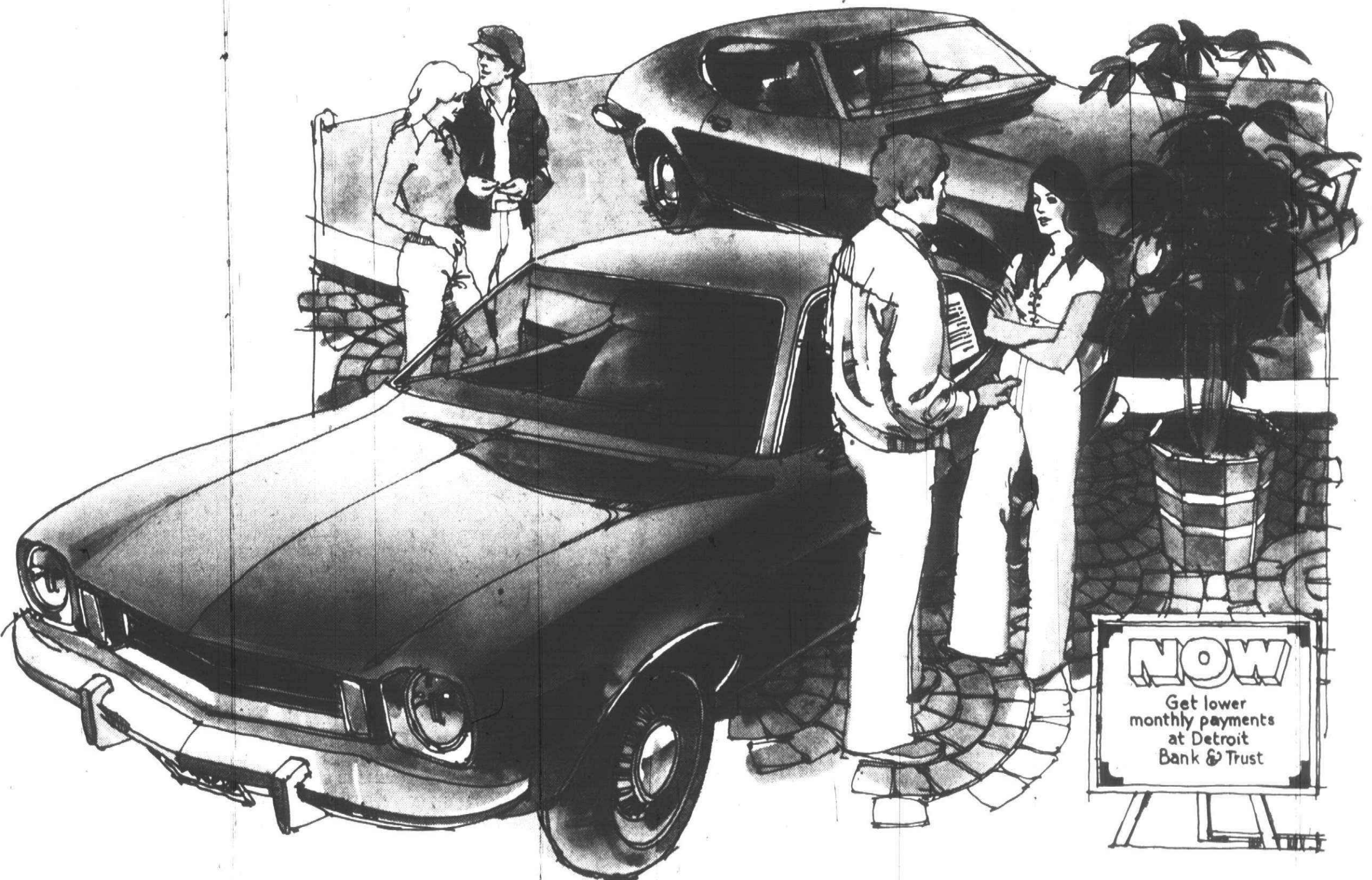
Of the 99 positions, 67 per cent were part-time jobs, 13 per cent were summer jobs, 11 per cent temporary positions, and about nine per cent were full-time positions.

Of the 99 placements made, one-fifth of the students have since terminated employment.

Some 16 placements were with the YMCA, either as assistants, as an instructor, or for chores. Types of jobs received by others include: secretary, lay-out artist, car porter, bus boy, maintenance, summer camp, dishwasher, fabric sales, parts driver, house-keeping, gas station, farm labor, shoe sales, babysitting, counter help, food handler, teller, cook, cleaners trainee, tool making, cashier, and auto clean-up.

Of the 99 placements, four were drop-outs, four were graduates, and 91 were still in school.

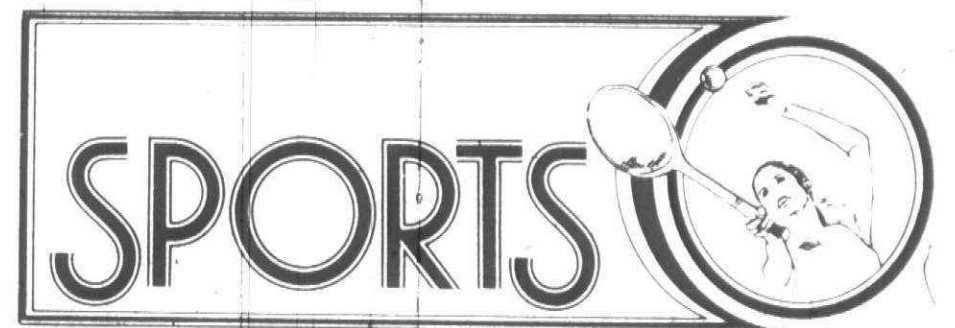
Scarpase was picked off second base minutes later, but Rob Taraskavage of Garden City East walked to put runners on first and second with no outs.

# Plymouth shutout of area girls track team

Area girl tracksters continued to make their marks this spring in the arena of competition. Times were lowered on the oval, while distances improved in jumping and throwing events.

The season was particularly rewarding for Livonia Stevenson, Westland John Glenn and Redford Bishop Borgess.

Stevenson won the Inter-Lakes League championship, Glenn claimed the Northwest Suburban League title and Borgess, in addition to placing first in several relay and invitational meets, tied for third place in the Class A state finals.

The 1977 edition of the All-Observer girls' track team is based on the final weekly listing as compiled by Redford Union coach Mike Krafchak and results of the state finals contested June 4.

Nadia Awad, shot put, Livonia Franklin. Only a sophomore, Awad placed first in the shot at the Northwest Suburban League Meet, at the Livonia Quad, at the regional and at the Borgess-Ladywood Relays. She was second in the state finals with a put of 41 feet two inches.

Awad, who was born in Cairo, Egypt, also threw the discus for the Patriots and placed fourth in the regional in that event.

"Nadia is an extremely diligent worker," said Franklin coach Richard Braun. "She has developed almost classic form."

Kyle Gray, discus, Livonia Churchill. A senior and three-year letterwinner, Gray placed first in both the discus and the shot put at the Western Six League Meet.

Churchill coach Audrey Kather said Gray finished first in the discus in all but two meets this year and first in the shot put in all but one meet.

Gray won the discus competition in the state AAU meet earlier this spring.

"She's competitive—very bright and creative," said Kather.

Ann Cwik, long jump, Redford Bishop Borgess. Cwik, the Most Valuable Player on the Spartans' squad this season, appeared in the area listing in four individual events—long jump, hurdles, 220-yard dash and 440-yard run.

One of the most versatile female track athletes in the area, Cwik placed first in both the long jump and hurdles this year at the Catholic League Meet.

The junior turned in the best long jump effort at the Alma Relays and finished first in the hurdles at the Central Michigan Relays.

Cwik was third in the long jump and fifth in the hurdles at the state finals.

Sue Basta, high jump, Livonia Churchill. Basta, a junior and two-year letterwinner, usually competed in the high jump, the 100-yard dash and the 440-yard relay every meet this season for the Chargers.

Basta won the high jump in all but three meets, said Audrey Kather, and placed first in the 100 in all but three meets.

Basta was a member of Churchill's league championship 440-yard relay team. "She has a lot of spirit and a lot of competitiveness," said Kather.

Kathy DuBois, two-mile run, Livonia Stevenson. DuBois, unbeaten in the two mile and mile this year in dual competition, finished first in the two mile at the Inter-Lakes League Meet, at the West Bloomfield Invitational and at the Livonia Quad.

The three-year varsity runner also was a member of the Spartans' victorious four-mile and distance medley relay teams at the Walled Lake Western Relays.

DuBois, a member of Stevenson's girls cross country state championship team last fall, is headed for Central Michigan University.

Julie Voyles, mile run, Livonia Stevenson. The junior won the mile at the Inter-Lakes League Meet and finished third in the event at the state finals.

Voyles, who has won two track letters and who has been a mainstay on the championship cross country team, holds Stevenson girls' records in both the mile, 5:16.5, and the two mile, 11:37.5.

She was second in the open mile at the West Bloomfield Invitational and ran a leg on the Spartans' winning four mile relay team and distance medley relay team at the Walled Lake Western Invitational and LaPlante Relays, respectively.

Wendy Tipton, 880-yard run, Livonia Stevenson. Tipton, who placed first in the 880 at the Inter-Lakes League Meet and sixth in the state finals, earned more points than any other Spartan this spring.

She also ran a leg of Stevenson's winning distance medley effort at the LaPlante Relays.

"Wendy's just a super sophomore who can run everything from the 440 up," said Stevenson coach Liz Embree. "She looks like a super prospect."

Sue Anderson, 440-yard run, Livonia Churchill. The senior co-captain, primarily a sprinter, scampered to victory in the 440 in all but two meets, said coach Audrey Kather.

In addition to competing in the open 440, Anderson also ran in the 880 and mile relays.

"Sue probably has been the hardest worker I've ever had," Kather said of the three-year performer. "She was the most looked up to sprinter on the team."

Janice Collins, 220-yard dash, Ladywood. In addition to winning the 100-yard dash and placing second in the 220 at the Catholic League Meet, Collins qualified for the state finals in the 100, 220 and long jump.

Collins, a sophomore, holds Ladywood school records in the three events for which she qualified for the state finals. She missed winning the 100 only twice in dual competition this season.

"You can count on her 100 per cent of the time to place," said Ladywood coach Steve Montgomery. "She's a consistent runner in big meets."

Kathy McDougall, 100-yard dash, Westland John Glenn. The two-year letterwinner finished first in the 100 and second in the long jump at the Northwest Suburban League Meet.

McDougall, a junior, qualified for the state finals in the 220, long jump, 440-yard relay and 880-yard relay.

"She's an outstanding runner," said Glenn coach Cheryl Caughey. "I can put her in about anything and she'll do well."

Cindy Mellas, hurdles, Garden City East. Mellas, probably the finest girl trackster ever to compete at East, finished first this year in both the hurdles and long jump at the Northwest Suburban League Meet.

The senior was undefeated in the hurdles in dual meets this season, placed second in the hurdles at the regional and was second in the state finals in the long jump.

Three times this spring Mellas won four individual events in one meet. She owns East girls' records in the hurdles, long jump, 100-yard dash and 220-yard dash. She also figures in East's 440- and 880-yard relay records.

"She has become an excellent tactician," said East coach Fred LaPlante.

Karen Bohland, Tina Harmon, Ann Cwik and Cheryl McKettrick, mile relay, Redford Bishop Borgess.

The quartet, competing as a unit almost all season long, placed first at the Catholic League Meet, at the Spartan Relays and at the Knight of Columbus-Bishop Foley Relays.

The foursome, which turned in a best time of the season of 4:05.5, also finished second at the West Bloomfield Invitational and at the Borgess-Ladywood Relays.

McKettrick also competed in the open 880 and open mile, while Bohland and Harmon regularly competed in the open 440.

All except Harmon are underclassmen.

Karen Bohland, Kellie Compton, Tina Harmon and Ann Cwik, 880-yard relay Redford Bishop Borgess.

This Borgess foursome, undefeated in league duals, placed first at the Catholic League Meet and at the Knights of Columbus-Bishop Foley Relays. The group also finished first at the regional.

Compton, in addition to running a leg of the 880 relay, also competed in the open 100 and 220.

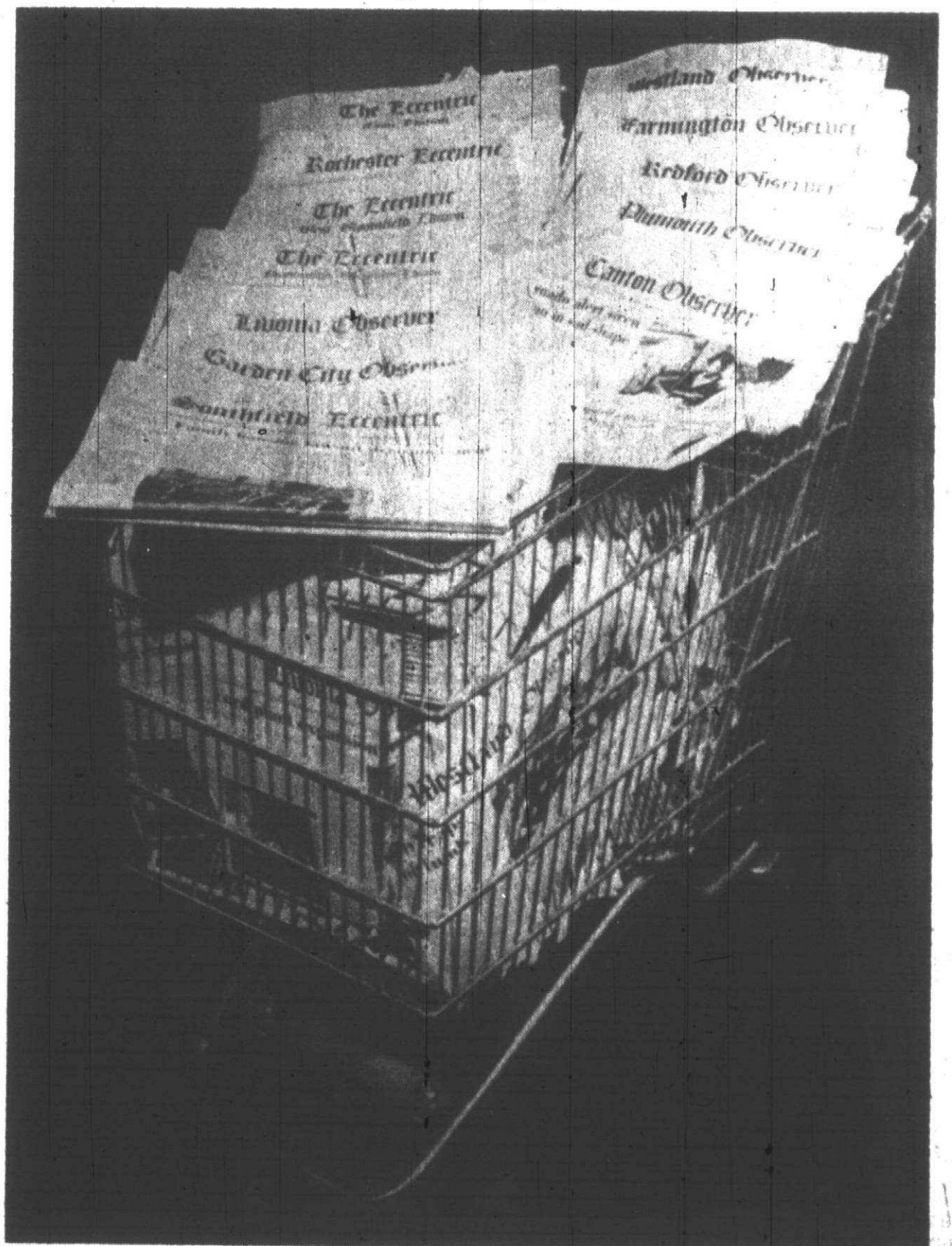
Kathy Schmidt, Karen Schmidt, Lori Olenzek and Patty DeMarco, 440-yard relay, Livonia Stevenson.

# The Stroller

## Rare surprise in nursing home

The world may be filled with surprises, as some folks say, but none of them would be more pleasant and surprising than one The Stroller experienced the other afternoon—and of all places in a convalescent home.

Invited to speak to a group of senior citizens as part of the program sponsored by Schoolcraft College at the Dorvin Center in Livonia he had come expecting most anything, especially when he had been told that the "old timers" wanted to discuss the sports scene in the 1920s.

"You'll find these elderly folks very interesting," Carolyn Gallogly, the Schoolcraft representative, explained. "But don't take it personally if one or two of them fall asleep. They have a habit of doing that."

### Law protects handicapped

Michigan Lt. Gov. James J. Damman recently signed a bill making it a misdemeanor for non-handicapped persons to use parking spots designated for use by handicapped persons in public parking lots.

The bill adds a new section to the Michigan Motor Vehicle Code defining the term "handicapper." For the purpose of the act it refers to a person who has a physical characteristic categorized as a handicap "which limits ambulation or necessitates the use of a wheelchair for mobility."

The bill gives the handicapped person the option of receiving a specially-designated license plate from the Secretary of State or a transferable serial-numbered certificate for personal use. The certificate can be used by someone other than the handicapped person who is driving.

Canton Township has an ordinance that prohibits anyone who is not handicapped from parking in a specially-designated parking spot. Police have been enforcing the law in Canton.

## 'Exorcist II— Asinine script + nice photos = ugh!

The year is only half over, but already we have a bounty of movies sure of a spot among the top 10—the 10 worst films of 1977. My nomination for that infamous list is "Exorcist II—The Heretic" (R).

Here we have a disheartening example of some fantastic photography joined to one of the most asinine scripts ever put to film. The plot (I use the term generously) concerns Father Lamont (Richard Burton) trying to validate and carry on the work of Father Merrin (Max von Sydow). Father Merrin died four years ago—in "The Exorcist"—exorcising the demon from young Regan MacNeil (Linda Blair).

Father Lamont wants to save Regan's soul. But Regan is in psychoanalysis with Dr. Tuskin (Louise Fletcher), who wants to save Regan's psyche. Dr. Tuskin works in a modern, dehumanized, electronic and glass clinic that practices things like "synchronous hypnosis."

Naturally, Regan hasn't been helped a bit. Lamont discovers that there is a demon within Regan called a Pazuzu. Such a discovery might baffle the Surete or Scotland Yard or the FBI but not Father Lamont.

HE KNOWS all about the Pazuzu. It comes from Africa. When it's just hanging around loose, not inhabiting anyone's body, it takes the shape of a giant locust. At other times, it's a swarm of locusts.

How it got from Africa to Regan in New York and why it assumes such a strange form are puzzling questions. But, puzzling in a Donald Duck way, not a Department of Logic way.

Thus it would be futile to dwell on the whys and wherefores of this movie. Trying to rationally explain the irrational only presents an irrational variant.

One wonders why two such fine actors as Richard Burton and Louise Fletcher (Nurse Ratched from "One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest") are in this silly movie. Of course, the pay is good but another consideration is that "The Heretic" requires fine actors. Who else could recite the dialogue without cracking up?

Burton declaims his lines with a stentorian seriousness worthy of Shakespearean drama. As Father Lamont, he requests the cardinal's permission to travel to Africa to seek a holy man who may be able to help him rid Regan of the Pazuzu.

THE CARDINAL, suspicious that Lamont may be a bit "tetchy" in the head, suggests that he go on a retreat. Lamont declines, solemnly proclaiming, "I want to advance, not retreat." Louise Fletcher as Dr. Tuskin suffers the same fate from this merciless script.

The conclusion of the movie compounds the nonsense in one gigantic mishmash. In a quiet, residential, Georgetown neighborhood, Regan, Lamont and Tuskin confront the Pazuzu.

This encounter results in a car crash, fire, screams, yells, an attack of swarming locusts and a house that explosively tears apart and crashes to the ground. The special effects people are unstinting.

Does any neighbor go to a window or walk outside to see what all the racket is about? No. The theater audience reels with laughter while the neighborhood remains quiet. Nobody's noticed anything.

Father Lamont emerges from the wreckage, embraces Dr. Tuskin, then walks off into the moonlit night with nymph Regan! A few neighbors finally appear. Dr. Tuskin looks up with tears in her eyes—undoubtedly, tears of joy that the wretched movie is over—and says, "I understand now." This puts her light-years beyond the rest of the cast, not to mention the audience.

There is one positive aspect of "The Heretic." It makes all other movies look great in comparison.

**ROLLERCOASTER** (PG). Suspense thriller about extortionist (Timothy Bottoms) who plants bombs at amusement parks and a safety inspector (George Segal) who doesn't think that's funny.

**STAR WARS** (PG). Serio-comic sci-fi adventure about a rebellion of solar systems in a distant galaxy. Good time movie with laughs and special effects. Two robots steal the show.

**THREE WOMEN** (PG). Director Robert Altman's strange, provocative study of the merging relationships of three women and their alienation in a masculine world.

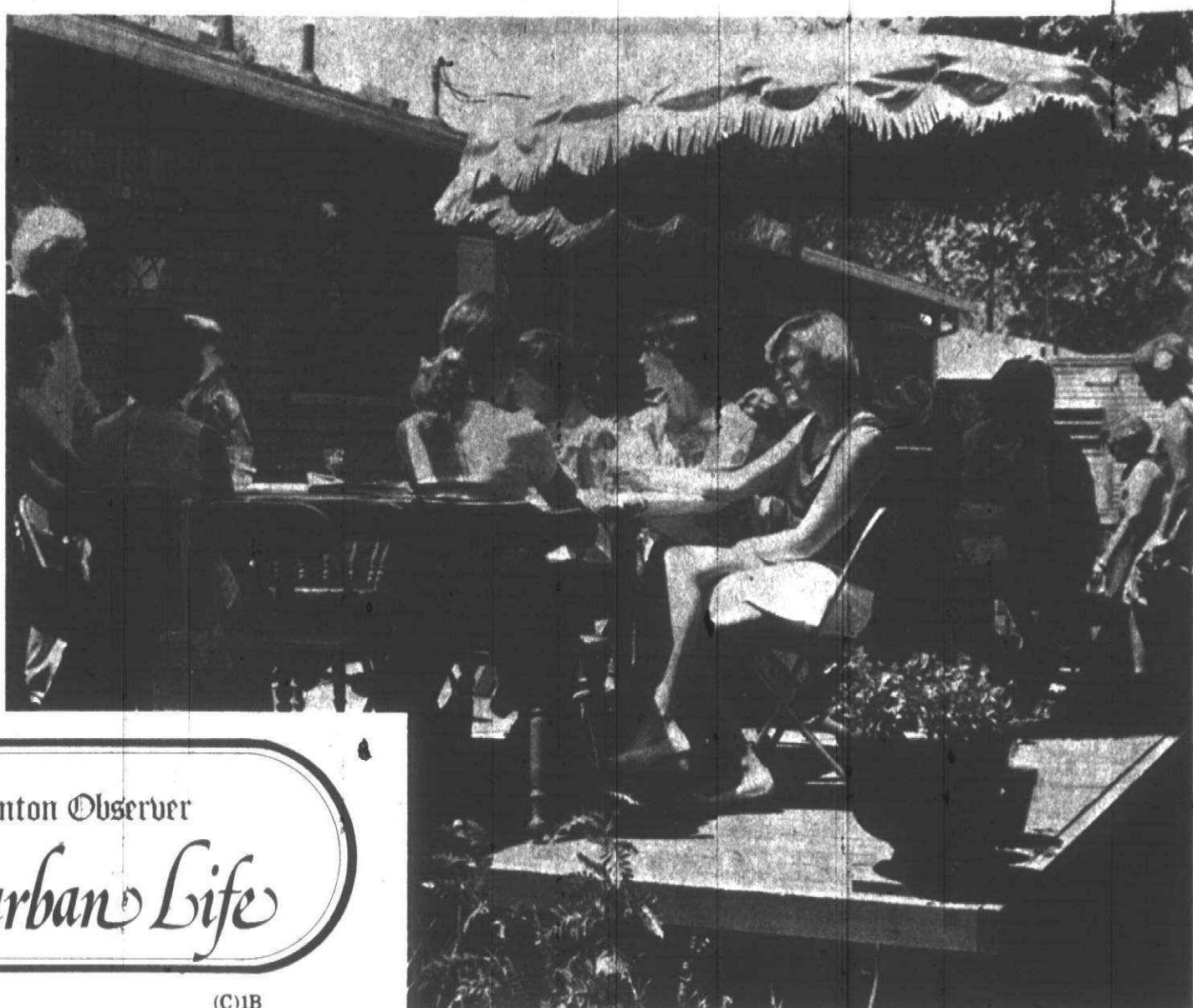

Girls State is an outgrowth of the Boys State program developed by Illinois Legionnaires in 1935. It is designed as a youth citizenship training course in the processes of American government and is supplemental to high school civics classes.

The isolated Illinois convention that began during the depression as a public service soon gained the attention of other states. In 1936, Pennsylvania, Ohio and West Virginia adopted similar programs.

By 1938, individual state legion ladies auxiliaries developed Girls State under the same guidelines as their predecessor.

TODAY, THE TWO programs run simultaneously in all 50 states. Although uniform in purpose, each convention follows its state's laws. This allows a more personalized and relevant experience for the members.

High school girls, like the three who attended Michigan Girls State, must have a high scholastic aptitude, possess leadership qualities, and demonstrate an interest in government. They also must have completed their junior year in high school as civics is an 11th grade subject.

Names of eligible students are submitted by the high schools to local American legion auxiliaries. Evelyn Johnson, a member of the Plymouth committee, screened the applicants and helped those who were accepted to find sponsoring organizations.

Cheri was sponsored by the Woman's Club of Plymouth, Susan by the Plymouth branch American Association of University Women, and Barbara by the Legion Auxiliary. The sponsors provided the \$95 registration fee.

WHEN THE GIRLS arrived at the host school, Olivet College in Olivet, Mich., they were immediately were caught up in a whirlwind of activity. Each was assigned to a fictitious city and a political party. They quickly

began the process of electing city, county and state officials.

Susan became a Federalist and was assigned to the city of Ferguson. During the first few days, she was elected to the city council and appointed county health director.

Barbara, also a Federalist, was appointed director of parks and recreation for the city of Hodges and sergeant-at-arms for the party convention.

Cheri was a Nationalist party member and was elected to the city council of Rohrer. She became an elite representative of the assembly by passing her bar examinations. Out of 500 girls taking the test, less than 100 were accepted as lawyers.

As an attorney, Cheri witnessed an unusual mock trial. The girls planned a crime, executed it, arrested the suspects, and conducted an investigation, which led to acquittal for the defendants due to a lack of evidence. Each

step was followed according to Michigan legal procedure which gave Cheri an intimate picture of courtroom activity and the judicial system.

FUNCTIONING on as little as five hours sleep, the representatives moved from local and county levels to state government procedures. After caucusing, lobbying and holding party conventions, the entire group assembled for the state elections. Using voting machines, they elected their officials including two representatives to Girls Nation, which will be in Washington, D.C. in July.

All three came home with unforgettable experiences. They made many new friendships. Among them were members of the American legion auxiliaries on hand as organizers and supervisors of this complex activity.

Before attending Girls State, each representative pledges to share the information she has gained with fellow classmates and the community.

LITTLE JILL LAWRENCE may some day participate in a Girls State.

The Morgan horse breed, oldest breed developed in the United States,

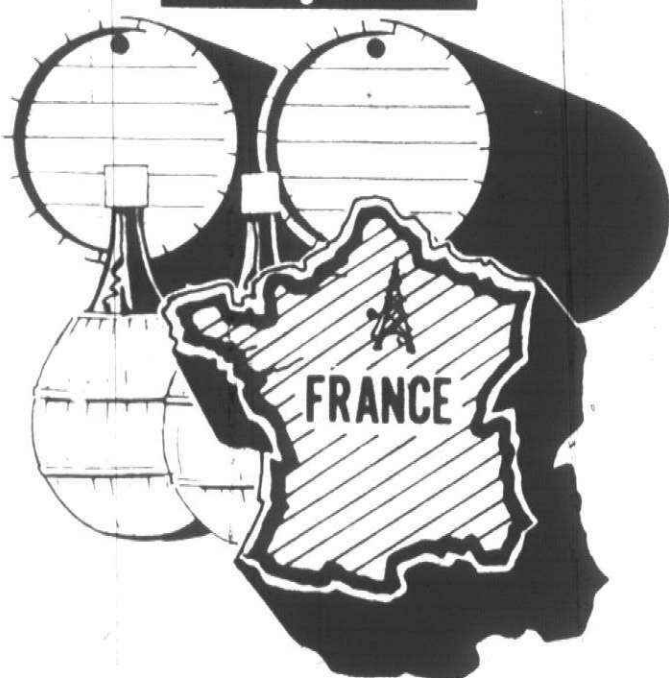

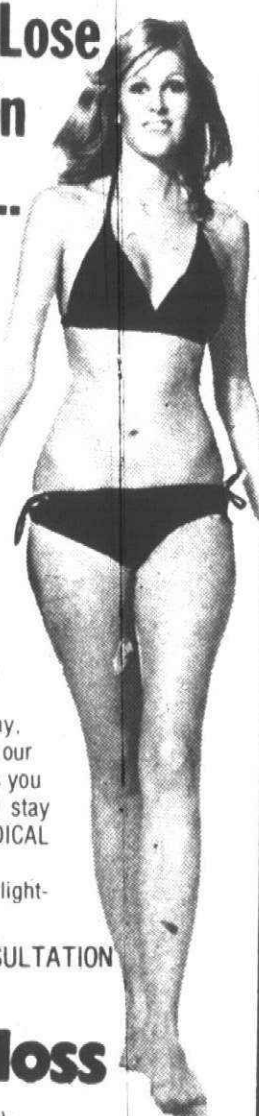

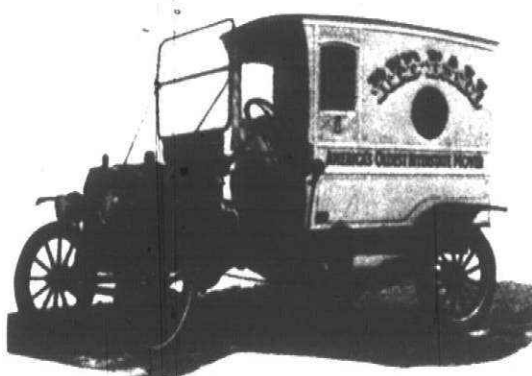

## Area families participate in eating patterns survey

Selected Wayne County residents are helping to determine future eating patterns in America by participating in the largest government study of food consumption ever undertaken.

A total of 175 households in this area are reporting the details of their eating habits as part of the year-long project, which is being directed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and conducted by the National Analysts Division of Booz, Allen & Hamilton. Two other area residents are also involved in the study as interviewers.

Wayne County is one of only 114 areas across the country chosen for this survey. It was selected as being representative of similar areas in this part of the country.

Families from this area will be joined by more than 23,000 others from all 50 states and Puerto Rico in the massive study of Americans' dietary and nutritional patterns.

THE SURVEY will reveal how changes in the American life style affect the way we eat. Smaller families, greater numbers of older people, different life styles, the number of people who eat away from home, the growing number of women working outside the home, the increasing popularity of home-produced food to offset

rising food costs—all may be factors in changing dietary and nutritional patterns.

Data from this survey will be used in many nutrition and education programs, and are a primary source of statistical information used in evaluating and developing national food and nutrition policies.

The real significance lies one step beyond finding out what, when, how much, and with whom Americans are eating. It lies in what's done with that mass of information. And past USDA food studies are leading examples of translating research into action.

Former USDA food studies have been a factor in the development of such concrete consumer benefits as various school lunch and food assistance programs, food fortification and enrichment programs, nutrition education programs and dietary guidance materials, and special assistance plans for such high nutritional risk groups as the young, the elderly, and the poor.

IT IS TOO EARLY to predict what the current study will uncover. But it's safe to say that a number of federal agencies which administer programs on the adequacy of diets and food safety will be watching the results carefully.
